Township police seize drugs, money, guns

Until last Thursday, a two-story brick ranch house located at 48465 Seven Mile held a secret which belied its rather nondescript appearance.

By Friday, the house and its contents were secret no more, and yielded a cache of drugs, weapons and contraband rarely seen in Northville.

Township police and other local law enforcement agencies raided the home at about 6 a.m. Thursday and

arrested at least one man on suspicion of marijuana and firearms possession.

Township tax records indicate the home is owned by James W. Parnin. Police would not say by press time Friday if Parnin was a suspect in the investigation, but at least one of the three primary suspects is a Northville Township resident.

Police confiscated up to 32 pounds of marijuana, about \$6,000 in cash, eight rifles and shotguns, three loaded pistols, a pistol-sized cross bow, telephone pagers, gold jewelry

a computer and files, and a document-laden briefcase from the home.

The marijuana had an estimated street value of \$55,000, police said.

The raid was prompted by a routine traffic stop just hours earlier. Township police Capt. Philip Presnell said Officer John Werth stopped a vehicle just before 11 p.m. Sept. 16 near Beck and Eight Mile.

Werth reportedly discovered at least a pound of marijuana in the

PTA group analyzes proposals

Members of the Legislative Action Network, an ad hoc committee of the Northville PTA, are hoping to share what they learned about property tax relief and school finance reform this summer with the community.

Their hope is that their information will help Northville voters make educated decisions before casting ballots in November.

The 16-member committee was

formed in the spring to research the two tax proposals slated for the November general election ballot.

In an effort to help voters understand the proposals before them, LAN members will be distributing information about all of the tax proposals at school and community events, running a column in the *Record* and publishing information in the *School News*, the district's newsletter.

In addition, LAN will co-sponsor a "town hall" meeting on the tax proposals Oct. 21 at Northville High

School with the League of Women Voters. Sponsors and advocates of the pending tax proposals are expected to discuss their bills and answer questions that night from 7:30 to 9:30.

Proposal C on the ballot is Gov. John Engler's Cut and Cap plan, and Proposal A is House Joint Resolution-H.

Supporters of two other school aid plans — the Olmstead/Kearney Proposal and the KIDS concept — are still drumming up support for their

bills with petition drives, said LAN chairperson Lynda Baca. Those proposals could see legislative action now or exposure on future election ballots if they garner enough voter support from petitions. For now, neither is on the ballot.

Proposal C would cap annual property assessment increases at 3 percent and reduce school operating property taxes 30 percent if voters say yes Nov. 3. The state would reim-

DDA sends plan to council for review

Fears of lost street parking notwithstanding, the Downtown Development Authority has passed a plan to expand the city's downtown development district and fund a new Cady Street parking deck.

The DDA passed the proposed plan by a 6-1 vote last Tuesday, with Glenn Long the sole dissenter. William Demray and new member Dewey Gardner were absent.

The city council will host a public hearing on the plan Nov. 2. In the meantime, affected property owners and governmental entities will be notified and given the opportunity to offer their comments.

The 17-page draft consists of two sections: a development plan describing the \$6 million in proposed improvements and a tax increment financing plan outlining how the improvements would be funded.

The proposed development includes the cost of ongoing property acquisition for the 470-space parking deck, deck construction, Cady Street relocation and extension of the downtown streetscape along Center, Main and Cady.

The improvements would be financed through a 15- or 20-year bond issue paid off by captured tax revenue from businesses within the district. The captured taxes would come from increases in property assessments, and so would not reduce existing tax revenues for local taxing bodies.

City Manager Gary Word noted that the plan, an update of the city's Mainstreet '78 plan, was needed for two reasons.

"We had to revise the (Mainstreet '78) plan for the deck project to take place," he said, adding that expanding the district to encompass Ford's vacant Griswold Street valve plant will give the city added control over its reuse.

"I think it has a direct impact on the deck and a direct impact on the Ford Plant, potentially," Word said.

"It's imperative that the plan be adopted before the end of the year to take effect in 1993," he added.

The plan — titled Mainstreet '92 — had stalled at previous DDA meet-

ings as Long objected to its inclusion of a diagram showing a relocated Cady Street intersecting with the Hutton Street intersection. The move was seen as a first step toward turning Hutton into a two-way street.

Long argued that widening the street to accommodate two lanes would take away some of the street-side parking and drive his family's firm, Long Plumbing and Fancy Bath Boutique, out of business. He added that the First Presbyterian Church on the east side of Hutton might object to losing spaces, and reminded the DDA of previous threats of legal action from shop owners east of the proposed deck if Cady was relocated away from their shops.

A four-member subcommittee consisting of DDA members Long, Greg Presley and Dee Richardson, and City Manager Word, was formed to review those concerns. The subcommittee focused on several issues, Presley said, including parking, potential impacts on the church and retailers, and potential changes to the deck. A previously rejected proposal to run Cady Street through the deck resurfaced during the discussion.

Other options considered by the subcommittee were making Mary Alexander Court a two-way street and changing its angled parking to straight-in parking to increase the number of spaces there.

"Close-in parking is the issue, and we are going to do the best we can to replace those spaces... but we have to do more research," Presley said.

Major revisions to the plan may not be necessary, however, judging by preliminary feedback from affected property owners.

"We have found out tentatively that the church is willing to negotiate (to make Hutton two-way)," Presley said. The church's governing board will formally review the proposal within the next several weeks.

Don Bingham, owner of a building between Mary Alexander Court and Cady Street, told the DDA Sept. 15 that he liked the idea of two-way traffic on Hutton. He added that he would only be in favor of relocating Cady to the south, as is proposed by the current Mainstreet '92 plan, if Hutton was turned into a two-way street to improve traffic flow.

Independent school group forms

As president of the new Advocates for Quality Education, Mike Hasler said he and the group intend to take a proactive and objective approach to education in Northville.

"We intend to be as objective as we can be," he said about the new citizens' group composed of parents and volunteers involved in the Northville schools.

"In some cases we will agree with the administration and with the School Board, and in some cases we'll disagree. That doesn't make either one of us right or wrong. And sometimes — based upon our perceptions — that will put us at odds. And that's okay too."

"What we intend to be is citizen's advocates for seeking out the facts and laying them out."

Hasler and about 25-30 people have been actively working to create a mission statement, elect officers and draft bylaws for AQE. Now that those are down on the books, AQE is focusing on its first membership drive meeting, which is scheduled for Sept. 30 at 7:30 p.m. at the high school Forum.

"We are hoping for a big turnout," Hasler said. We are hoping we can get a significant level of involvement."

Hasler hopes the group's agenda and commitment to providing unbiased and complete information to the Northville community will attract a healthy crowd to its first public meeting.

"This organization is intended to be completely inclusive. In fact, we are anxious for people to join us," he said in a press release announcing the membership meeting.

"We are pro-vote. Not anti-tax nor pro-millage," he said. "Instead what we are saying is, 'Let's do something for our kids.'"

Hasler said the group's primary concern is the quality of education for the students of Northville. In an attempt to monitor, evaluate and change things for the better in the schools, Hasler said the group's focus is to take a hard look at educational issues — at both the state and local level — that will have an impact on Northville schools.

"We want to be a Northville think tank for educational issues," said

AQE's communications representative, Lynda Baca.

"There's never been a (citizens) group in Northville that sits down and looks at the issues and sifts through the issues to see how they affect us," she said. "That is what we want to become — an impartial group of citizens that looks at issues that affect education."

As part of its plan, AQE intends to study a variety of issues that are brewing at the state and national level that could have an impact on Northville schools. AQE members hope to take that information and boil it down to show how it impacts Northville.

Firefighters show concern for the community

Frank had been at it since early that morning. He had rolled out of bed at 4:02 a.m. for a medical call, and had barely fallen back to sleep when the alarm clock sounded. Frank showered, shaved, put on his uniform and headed for the station to help get things ready for the parade. The Fourth of July was a big day in Northville, and a busy day for the Fire Department.

After the parade Frank headed for the Fire Safety House, on display in town for the day, and worked for a couple more hours. He felt lucky to have some time at home with his family late in the afternoon. That evening, Frank returned to the station and received his assignment for the fireworks. The crowd was large, and enjoyed the display, but Frank missed most of it while he tended to those who reported to his first aid station with various minor ailments. After the crowd cleared out, the trucks

were returned to the station and washed, and Frank made it home and to bed by midnight. he set his alarm to make sure he would be up in time to conduct a tour of the fire station the next morning.

The firefighters in our community are not, literally, "volunteers." They receive an hourly wage when responding to alarms or when attending some training sessions. At the same time, much of what our firefighters do to help make our community safe is done on time which is truly volunteered. Most of the time our firefighters spend in activities related to public fire safety education, for example, is volunteered. Whether it involves speaking to a scout group, conducting a tour of the fire station, helping to show the Fire Safety House at some event in the Northville or Plymouth area, or producing a video fire safety message, these are activities which our community's firefighters undertake because they believe it is important, not because it is reflected in a paycheck.

The same is true of most of the public events in which

the fire departments of our community participate. Whether it involves driving a fire truck in a parade, selling newspapers with the Goodfellows, ringing the bell for the Salvation Army or staffing a first aid station at the Victorian Festival, firefighters undertake to do these things because they are, most fundamentally, a part of the community. Our community is an exciting place to live and work because of the many hours of effort volunteered by the people who call Northville home, and this includes the members of the Fire Departments. Our Fire Departments take great pride in their professionalism, but performing their mission in a professional manner does not always require that a rate of pay be attached to the job.

In these times of tight municipal budgets, when the available tax dollars are already spread too thin, our firefighters have volunteered their time to raise the money necessary for important projects. In the last year, for example, many hundreds of hours were devoted to raise the money needed to build the Northville/Plymouth Community Fire Safety House and to purchase a cardiac def-

brillator. The people of Northville responded generously to these efforts, which underscores one of the most important lessons about the relationship between our firefighters and the people they serve; that they are one and the same, both parts of the community.

As summer turned to fall Frank helped to prepare for the Fire Department's annual Halloween party. On the big night hundreds of his neighbors descended on the fire station to consume popcorn, cotton candy, apple cider, and soft drinks, and to participate in the costume judging contest. After the party, when the station was cleaned up, the chief asked for volunteers to help one of the schools in town string Christmas lights with the ladder truck. Frank remembered how important those lights had been to him each year when he attended school, and raised his hand. He was happy to help.

burse local school districts.

Proposal A would cap assessment increases at 5 percent a year.

LAN's task back in June was to study all the tax proposals and see what impact each would have on the Northville community and its school district.

After months of evaluating the proposals, Baca said all three proposals have problems.

"They are all flawed," she said. "Not one of the proposals has any funding attached to it. Cut and Cap costs as much as O/K, but it suggests that funding will be paid out of the economic growth in the state. I think that is a shaky supposition at this time.

"Cut and Cap also doesn't make any provisions for inequity."

"The problem with O/K is that it caps school property taxes at 30 mills. That's a problem here in Northville, where our district is only about one-third built. The question is, in 10-15 years can we live with that cap with all the growth the district is expecting?"

In contrast to its ballot counterparts, O/K provides property tax relief and returns the state to equitable state funding of education, Baca said. (see tax proposal chart.)

Baca said another problem with Cut and Cap is that it could take an additional \$6 million to \$7 million away from Northville. That money would then be put in the hands of the state and control of it would remain there too.

"They saw that money would be reimbursed to us, but historically that hasn't happened with all the recapturing," she said. "So you have to wonder is the first shoe to take it away and then the second shoe to recapture all of it?"

"We believe the analysis demonstrates that either Cut and Cap or HJR-H could have significant negative effect on the Northville community and its schools."

THE GENERAL ELELCTION

A Comparison of Property Tax Proposals

The proposals House Joint Resolution-H and Cut and Cap will appear on the November 1992 ballot.

PROPOSAL: HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION-H (HJR-H)

Explanation:
HJR-H limits home property tax assessment increases to 5 percent per year or the rate of inflation, whichever is less. When the home is sold it is re-evaluated to reflect its market value.

What is the cost to the State of Michigan?
HJR-H does not cost the state any money and could increase state tax revenues. Instead, HJR-H limits how much local government can increase the assessed value of property. HJR-H does not limit how much voters can

increase their own millage tax rates

What is the cost to Northville Public Schools?
For every 1 percent increase in SEV, above the 5-percent cap, Northville Public Schools will be unable to collect \$200,000

Is it a tax cut?
HJR-H limits home assessment increases. It does not limit millage rates

What does it mean to the Northville community?
If inflation (and consequently

the cost of running local government) increases beyond the 5-percent assessment limit, or if student population grows, local millage rates may have to be increased to maintain programs and services

PROPOSAL: CUT AND CAP

Explanation:
Cut and Cap is Gov. John Engler's plan. It calls for a 30-percent cut in school property taxes. The cut would take effect in stages over the next five years. The state would reimburse the schools for the 30-percent cut. At the same time, property assessment increases would be capped at 3 percent per year, or the rate of inflation, whichever is less. The property would be re-evaluated when sold.

What is the cost to the State of Michigan?
This proposal initially would transfer control of \$7 million from the Northville area to the state government.

What is the cost to Northville Public Schools?
For every 1 percent increase in SEV, above the 3 percent cap, Northville Public Schools will be unable to collect \$200,000

Is it a tax cut?
Cut and Cap calls for a 30 percent cut in school property taxes plus a 3 percent cap on assessments, until the property is sold. If the tax cut is not replaced with economic growth, Cut and Cap would be funded by program cuts in other areas or a state increase. Cut and Cap does not cap millage rates

What does it mean to the Northville community?
Cut and Cap would cause a decrease in tax money from commercial and industrial property since this plan caps all property assessments — business and home.

Cut and Cap does not solve the funding inequity between wealthy and tax-base-poor school districts. Even after the reimbursement for

the cut funds, the inequity in funding remains. This inequity is the reason legislators give for "Robin Hood" plans.

However, Cut and Cap does not prevent the Legislature from rechanneling current state aid from Northville to other districts.

WAYS IN WHICH HJR-H AND CUT AND CAP ARE THE SAME

HJR-H and Cut and Cap will cause unequal taxes between similar properties if those properties were purchased at different times. Properties would be re-evaluated at the time of sale.

HJR-H and Cut and Cap offer NO protection from Robin Hood plans.

HJR-H and Cut and Cap do not require the state to make up for revenues lost by Northville schools, city, township, or county due to the cap.

The Homestead Property Tax Credit program would reduce the property tax relief for some individuals

PROPOSAL: OLMSTEAD/KEARNEY(O/K)

O/K will not be on the November '92 ballot. You may be asked to sign a petition to place O/K before the Legislature. O/K supporters hope to have their proposal ready for consideration by the state Legislature before the November 1992 election. This would provide an alternative to the school funding problem if both HJR-H and Cut and Cap are defeated in the election.

Explanation:
O/K requires the state to pay 50 percent of the cost (as defined by the state) of K-12 education, PLUS the proceeds from the lottery.

O/K would roll back and cap school operating property taxes to 30 mills and eliminate tax base sharing.

O/K would also eliminate further Robin Hood type cuts to out-of-formula school districts like Northville.

What is the cost to the State of Michigan?
O/K would cost the state \$1.6 billion annually. \$750 million of which would reimburse school districts for the 30-mill rollback, and \$900 million of which would increase the school aid formula to move toward more equalized school funding.

O/K would be funded by economic growth in the state. This growth is expected, in part, because lower property taxes will hopefully attract businesses to the state.

What is the cost to Northville Public Schools?
Nothing, but neither will Northville Public Schools receive any additional funds.

Is it a tax cut?
No. Currently Northville Public School tax is just under 30 mills. If the economic growth did not occur the plan would be funded by program cuts in other areas or a tax increase.

What does it mean to the Northville Community?
O/K provides no new funding for Northville Public Schools. Supporters say O/K would prevent any further cuts in state aid and allow the school's administration to plan a budget without constant state threats and last minute changes.

O/K caps school tax rates at 30 mills. A majority of voters could not increase millage rates to fund school operation and programs. Voters could increase their millage tax for school property, facilities or equipment.

O/K DOES offer protection from Robin Hood plans.

O/K DOES NOT affect tax assessments.

tion, district employee contracts, voter turnout analysis, and privatization are just some of the issues penciled in on the group's calendar.

Recently some of the group members had the opportunity to meet with the Student Congress at the high school to hear the students' reactions to recent budget cuts and the quality of the programs left at the high school.

In a half-hour briefing, AQE members learned students were frustrated with larger class sizes, a lack of arts supplies, and the merging of advanced and beginner classes in art and foreign language.

That is just one way AQE is taking the initiative and gathering information about what's going on in the schools.

Many of the group's faces are the same as those who participated in the now-defunct Citizens for Quality Education group, which supported recent school millage requests. Spearheading AQE are Hasler as president; Joan Wadsworth as vice president; Ed Sarkisian as treasurer; and Margaret Surdu as secretary. On the steering committee are officers and members at large Sharon Ferrara, Bill Phillips, Greg Purtell, and Ken Reisman. Kathy Arenz is in charge of membership. Joan Wadsworth will be overseeing issues the group will tackle, while Lynda Baca will be working on AQE's communications. Anna Sarkisian will be the press contact for the citizens' group.

"Certainly some of the people in Advocates are the same as those from Citizens for Quality Education. But that is not our intention. We are an inclusive group and we want people to feel they can be a part of us," Hasler said.

"We want people who are willing to learn about the issues and are willing to share that information with us. None of us are experts but we want people who are willing to become experts about the issues."

The bad taste the last two millage elections left in the mouths of voters and the distrust those campaigns built against the schools is the reason AQE formed, Hasler said.

"We are going to tell you flat out that we don't have a hidden agenda," he said. "There are still a tremendous amount of half-truths, innuendoes and misinformation still out there."

"We want to put information into the hands of each and every citizen in the Northville Public Schools District. We want to give objective and complete information of what's really happening in our schools."

Membership in the group is open to any resident of the district who shares an interest in improving the district's education. Annual membership is \$10 per person and \$2 for high school students eager to get involved. AQE's operating budget will be generated from memberships and private donations only.

Governor supports, coalition opposes Proposal C

Opponents say older and middle-class homeowners would get little benefit from Gov. John Engler's "Cut & Cap" property tax plan. Proposal C on the ballot.

Proposal C would cap annual property assessment increases at 3 percent and reduce school operating property taxes 30 percent if voters say yes Nov. 3. The state would reimburse local school districts.

"The cut would be offset, dollar for dollar, by a reduction in the homestead credit," objected Jim Hudson of the American Association of Retired Persons. AARP is one of 20 groups in

Advance Michigan, which is fighting both Proposals A and C.

"Among elderly households with incomes below \$75,000 a year, 70 percent would have the same property tax bill as before the cut," Hudson said last Monday in a Southfield news conference.

Economist Ruth Beier, of Michigan State University's Institute for Public Policy and Social Research and a former Treasury official in Gov. Blanchard's administration, gave this example of how "Cut & Cap" would affect a suburban family:

If its total property taxes are \$3,000, two-thirds going to schools, its tax bill would be cut by \$600 (30 percent of \$2,000), but its state in-

come tax rebate would be cut \$360, paring its savings to \$240. The family also would lose on the federal income tax, said Beier, bringing the benefit to only \$80.

In contrast, businesses and wealthier homeowners would get the full 30-percent cut.

Beier added, "The state has no choice but to raise taxes" to pay for Cut & Cap.

"Funding reimbursements with an increase in the state income tax would require an income tax rate of 6.3 percent by the year 2002. The current rate is 4.6 percent," she said.

Civic groups joining Advance Michigan in opposition to the proposals are: League of Women Voters, AARP,

Michigan PTA and Michigan Association of University Women. Union groups include the Michigan Education Association, AFL-CIO, United Auto Workers and Michigan Federation of Teachers. Government-related groups include the Michigan Municipal League, Michigan Association of School Boards, and others.

Gov. Engler's chief economic spokesperson, state Treasurer Douglas Roberts, made this case for Proposal C:

- He is confident the program's cost can be paid by dedicating half the annual 5 percent growth of state revenues.
- There will be little budget growth

for state employees, already well-paid. State colleges will have to become more efficient or raise tuition.

- Property tax rates on business and wealthy homeowners went up exactly the same amount of millage as for middle- and low-income homeowners, and their taxes all should be cut at the same rate.
- Proposal C should be viewed as an economic growth measure in a state that for 25 years has had unemployment rates higher than the national average. Reducing the tax on capital will encourage business investment — and jobs — in the reverse way that raising taxes has dampened investment and employment.

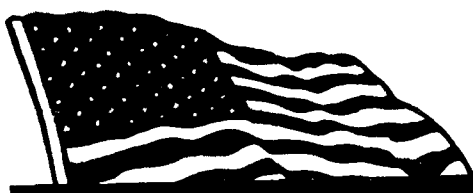
Budget procedure changes for worse

When the township budget review committee sits down to get to work Sept. 29, it's going to be in for a long session. The committee this year will operate under a procedure different from that used in the recent past. And while the old format may not have been ideal, the changes this time around appear to be for the worse.

For one, past budget review committees met with department heads to discuss budget wish lists in a series of mostly afternoon meetings. This year, the committee will go through all the departmental reviews — about \$4 million worth — in a single day, beginning at 8 a.m.

The problem here is threefold. First, public participation — always low in this type of meeting — may disappear completely. We can't see very many concerned citizens taking time off work to sit through a budget review session. Not everyone works, of course, but the public as a whole is much more likely to be able to attend something like this at night. That's why just about all local governmental bodies meet in the evening in the first place.

Second, the public is also discouraged from attending by not reliably knowing when a particular department will come up for review. Let's say Joe Township has a serious concern about Fire Department funding, but doesn't care or isn't informed as much about the other departments. When does he show up? Even if a schedule is produced, it will be

very difficult to stick to.

The third problem with the daylong format is the effect on the committee members. Budget review is grinding work; it takes a significant toll on the mind and on the level of energy. We can't help but think a department getting reviewed at 3 p.m. will not receive the same level of attention as a department reviewed at 10 a.m. And that's not good for either one.

Finally, the changes in composition of the committee this year provide one more cause for concern. The budget reviewers will be the township manager, township finance director, treasurer, and newly elected supervisor and treasurer. All those people undeniably belong on the committee, but past reviews have included citizens at large. We believe it's very important for "just folks" to be represented on the committee, particularly with the likely lower public participation resulting from the meeting time.

In the past, the budget review has dragged out over weeks and months and been a draining experience. It certainly wasn't perfect. But this year's format is a step in the wrong direction.

Metroparks note an important anniversary

Today it couldn't be done. Southeast Michigan couldn't launch a series of 13 metroparks covering 23,000 acres.

Tax fighters would battle the quarter-mill of property tax the metroparks cost. Politicians would be unable to cooperate on a multi-county basis.

Indeed, the state is shutting down campgrounds and spinning off parks rather than preserving scarce open space.

In 1942 it was different — better. Dr. Henry S. Curtis, one-time playgrounds director from New York City, and Professor Harlow O. Whittemore, landscape designer from the University of Michigan, had a vision: a series of parks along the Huron and Clinton rivers, encircling the urban area.

Leroy C. Smith of the Wayne County Road Commission put the dream together politically, winning legislative approval of a law to incorporate the Huron-Clinton Metropolitan Authority

and winning 2-1 approval of voters in five counties for a property tax.

This year it celebrates its 50th anniversary. We toast HCMA not just for winning good parks but for keeping alive that stupendous dream in the face of political pressure, backlashes and power grabs.

To most folks, the HCMA name doesn't ring a bell, but we all know its good works: Kensington Metropark, 4,300 acres, the first one, opened in 1948; the chain of Hudson Mills, Dexter-Huron and Delhi on the Huron River between Pinckney and Ann Arbor; Huron Meadows, south of Brighton and the newest; Lake Erie Metropark, with one of the state's first wave pools.

Where cities and townships are fighting to preserve open space and wetlands, HCMA did the job by starting a half-century ago.

We can thank the visionaries of the 1940s for the unspoiled outdoors we enjoy today.

It's important to be 'loaded'



I can remember the car my Mom owned when I was growing up.

It was a bright red 1965 Volkswagen Beetle, that she proudly proclaimed she bought on my first birthday in September 1964 for the princely sum of \$2,002. The only options available on the car were a bigger engine, a sunroof and an AM radio. She got all three. This VW was, in the parlance of car dealers, "loaded."

Loaded meant it came with skinny little tires, a manual transmission, a heater (so reliable it ran even in the summer), doggie dish hubcaps, vinyl seats and rubber mats on the floor; no carpeting.

As a kid, I didn't care about any of that. The one feature of our V-dub that made me happiest was something no other car had. Behind the back seat, where most cars had a package shelf, our car had a storage compartment. "The Mousehole," as I called it, was my favorite place to ride, at least until I got too big to fit.

With the arrival of the 1993 model year, even a base-priced, stripped-down, econobox comes with styled wheel covers, AM-FM stereo, all-season radials, power steering and brakes, airbags, an automatic transmission, and a plush interior that, yes, does include carpets. (None of them, sad to report, have storage behind the back seat, unless you count hatchbacks. It's still nothing like "The Mousehole.") Hell, you can't even order a car with rubber mats on the floor anymore.

But that laundry list of standard features serves to illustrate a point. In 1993, as compared with 1965, the price of entry has jumped quite a bit if you hope to compete. Nobody I've talked to really knows why.

Oh, some marketing guy will tug at his tie a little bit and spout some vague survey research terms at you, but even he doesn't know the real reason manufacturers make cars so much more comfy than they used to. That's just the way it is.

For law enforcement officers, whose business is stopping crimes, the price of entry has jumped in the last few years as well. The bad guys don't just carry switchblades and Saturday Night Specials anymore.

Nope, if you're a bad guy, and you hope to compete, you'd better be armed with a semi-automatic handgun, an assault rifle or better yet an Uzi or a Mac-10. Nobody knows why. That's just the way it is.

That's why I'm hoping the City of Novi comes up with the money to equip its officers with the semi-automatic sidearms the police department has requested. Up till now, the officers have been armed with six-shot revolvers that must be cocked with every pull of the trigger.

The semi-automatic pistols don't need to be cocked, and can fire 10 shots without a reload. It's the handgun equivalent of carpets on the floor. You can get by without one, but you're definitely operating on a 1960s standard.

As it stands now, the officers can purchase the 10-shot weapons with their own money. The city may or may not reimburse the officers, depending on what's in the budget.

As I see it, if we're going to send our officers out to beat the bad guys, we ought to send them out "loaded."

vehicle and arrested the driver and a passenger. Presnell would not say if the two men in the car had been to or were driving to the Seven Mile home, but police apparently were tipped off by the vehicle's occupants.

Presnell would not comment on reports that one of the three male suspects — ages 32, 23, and 20 — was the son of a suburban Detroit police chief.

Police were seeking warrants from the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office late Friday afternoon. At least one

of the suspects was in custody and was expected to be arraigned at 35th District Court in Plymouth.

At least one of the suspects has a criminal history, Presnell said. The man had spent prison time in Michigan on firearm and drug convictions, he said.

Fruitful search for red wine leads to merlot

The biggest name in California red wine is cabernet sauvignon. With that in mind, why has merlot (another outstanding red varietal with Bordeaux origins) shown the largest increase in popularity among American wine drinkers for the past several years?

That answer is easy. Americans buy wine to drink, not to collect. They age it in their car on the way home from the store. They treat wine as a beverage and do not build shrines to it. Therefore, they buy wines that are flavorful and delicious when purchased. This is why merlot has gained in popularity — it tastes great.

Although merlot is considered in the same class as cabernet sauvignon, merlot always has exuberant fruit elements and wonderfully supple textures.

You may have heard the myth that wine, especially red wine, should be aged some mystical length of time before one would dare pull the cork. Rubbish. If a wine doesn't taste good when it's young, it won't taste any better when it's old. It might even taste worse because with aging, fruit levels drop, and tannins become more evident.

Merlot is fruity, delicious and does not assault your palate with tongue-raking tannins. Winemakers realize that people want something to drink and don't want to have to learn to like it. Merlot is already likable.

Typically, merlot has aromas and flavors of cherries and plums with velvety textures that welcome you back for another sip. You may appreciate a big, chewy cabernet sauvignon, but one glass will suffice. Merlot tastes so good that you just can't leave it alone.

Both merlot and cabernet sauvignon are widely planted in France's Bordeaux region. Cabernet is the grape of choice in the Bordeaux region known as Medoc. There, the gravelly soils tend to temper the wine's natural aggressiveness. Merlot finds a good home in the Bordeaux regions of St. Emilion and Pomerol where the clay soils add depth and backbone to a wine that is inherently soft.

In California, where the weather is frequently better than Bordeaux, and the soils vary widely from place to place, merlot has found a very large and appreciative home. Washington State is also a key player, and several very good examples of merlot have made their way to Michigan from the northwest.

Now that we have whet your appetite, here is a summary of producers making excellent merlot. Keep in mind that style may vary some from one winery to another. You may also discover, by reading the bottle's back label that some producers add small percentages of cabernet franc or cabernet sauvignon to add depth, complexity and interest.

Matanzas Creek Winery, Havens Cellars, Shafer Vineyards, Leonetti Cellars, Robert Sinskey Vineyards, and Ravenswood Winery make generous, depthful wines to enjoy with beef, grilled lamb and hearty foods.

Pine Ridge Vineyards, Chateau Souverain, Hogue Cellars, Ferrari-Carano, Clos du Bois, Murphy-Goode and Stevenot are winery names to look for if you prefer a softer, more supple mouthfeel. These wines are great with grilled sausage, pasta, hamburgers and even grilled salmon.

Best-buy merlots that are value-priced and flavorful include Bel Arbors and Bogle.

Nice and cheesy Italian standbys taste better when fresh

Quiz most Americans on Parmesan and Romano cheeses and the likely response will be, "The stuff that comes in a can you shake on top of your spaghetti." Sacrilege, say the Italian food experts recently on hand at the annual Food and Wine Classic in Aspen, Colo. Why take two of the world's most consumed cheeses and reduce them to mere fast food?

The truth of the matter is real Parmigiano-Reggiano and Pecorino Romano can be used not simply as toppings for a favorite pasta, but as ingredients in flavorful dishes, as plain as table cheeses, even as desserts.

Most famous of all the Italian cheeses is Parmigiano-Reggiano, made from cow's milk. Legend tells that Molliere had a weakness for Parmigiano and often recommended it to his friends as the ultimate food.

"Many people perceive Parmesan cheese as dry and salty. That couldn't be further from the truth," explains Nancy Radke of Parmigiano-Reggiano's North American offices. "Even more are surprised that it's easily digestible, the lowest in fat and cholesterol of any of the aged cheeses and packed with protein."

Parmigiano-Reggiano is handmade with partially skimmed milk, aged at least two years and uses no preservatives, making even the rind edible.

"Authentic Parmigiano-Reggiano has our name stamped into the rind," reminds Radke. "For the best, tastiest results, buy it in chunks with the rind intact from your local deli and grate it fresh."

Radke also says that if you keep it tightly wrapped in the warmest part of the refrigerator, Parmigiano-Reggiano will last for months.

Another misunderstood Italian cheese is Pecorino Romano, one of the world's oldest cheeses. It's said Romulus nurtured himself with Pecorino when he founded Rome.

Called the "cheese with gusto," real Italian Romano is derived from 100 percent sheep's milk. Like Parmesan, Italian Romano has no preservatives, so purchase it in chunks, then grate fresh just before using.

Although finding fresh Romano cheese is somewhat more difficult than finding fresh Parmesan, the rewards are equally delicious.

Says Helen Studley, owner of New York's La Colombe d'Or restaurant, "There's no reason to buy pre-grated cheese anymore. Fresh Parmigiano has a nutty, extraordinary flavor and fresh Romano is hearty, robust — pure heaven."

"Both cheeses are excellent shaved over salads, mixed into sauces, melted over vegetables or simply eaten in chunks with fresh fruit."

Here are some recipes using Parmesan and Romano cheeses

SPAGHETTI IN SALSA

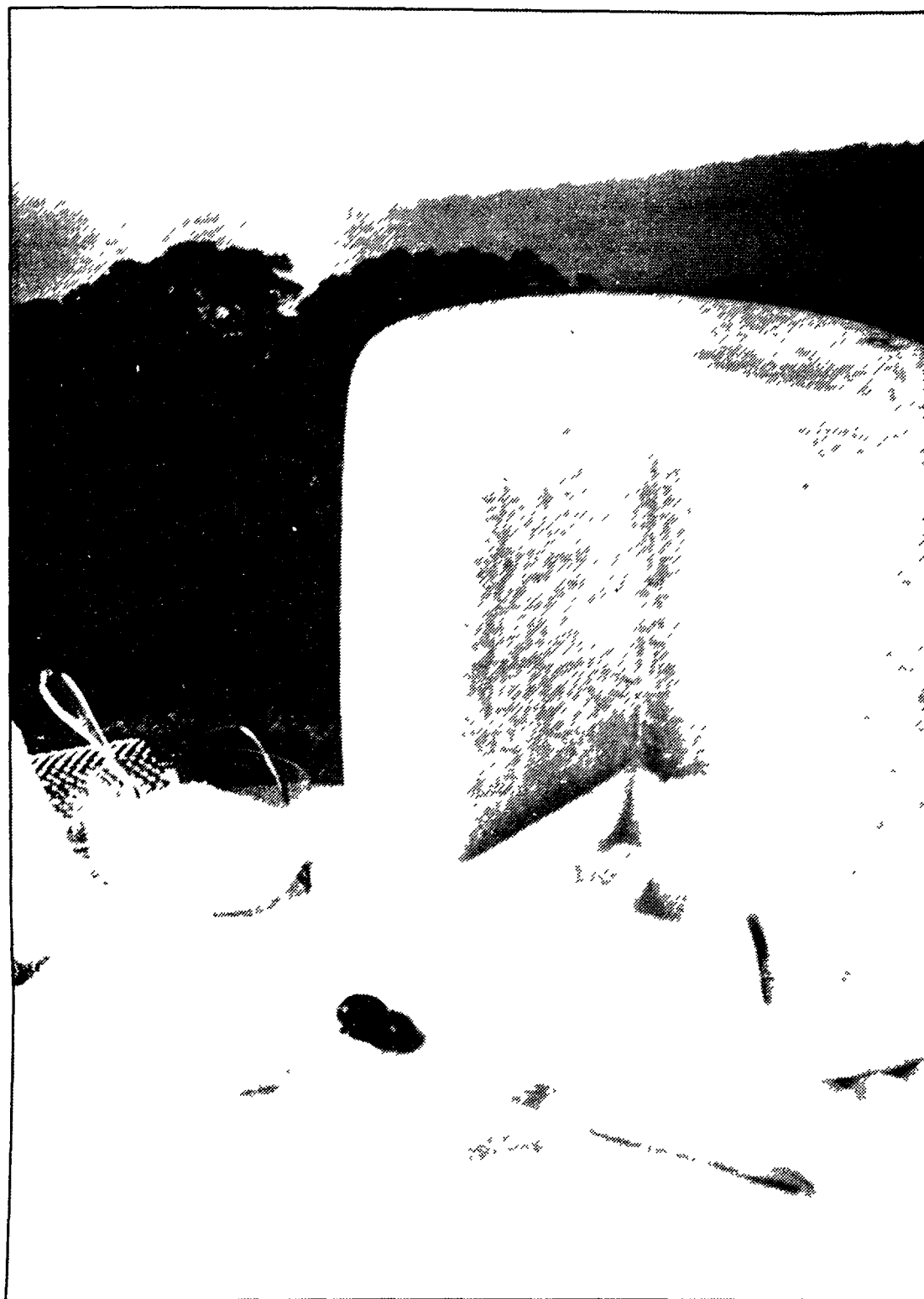
20 springs Italian parsley, leaves only
10 large basil leaves, fresh or preserved in salt
¼ cup olive oil
2 pounds very ripe tomatoes or 2 pounds canned tomatoes (preferably imported Italian, drained)
Salt and freshly ground pepper to taste
1 pound dried spaghetti
Course-grained salt to taste
Large pinch of ground saffron
1 tablespoon (½ ounce) sweet butter
8 ounces very thinly sliced Pecorino Romano

Yields 6 servings
Coarsely chop parsley and basil all together. Place medium-size casserole with oil over medium heat, and when oil is warm, add chopped ingredients and saute for 2 minutes, stirring every so often with wooden spoon.

Meanwhile, pass fresh or canned tomatoes through food mill, using disc with the smallest holes, into crockery or glass bowl. Add tomatoes to casserole, cover and cook for 25 minutes, stirring every so often with a wooden spoon. When sauce is almost ready, season with salt and pepper.

Place large pot of cold water over medium heat and preheat oven to 375 F. When water reaches a boil, add coarse salt, saffron and pasta, and cook for 8 to 11 minutes, that is 1 minute less than al dente. Drain pasta, transfer to crockery bowl, pour half of tomato sauce over pasta and mix very well.

Heavily butter a glass baking dish. Spread ½ of remaining tomato sauce on bottom of dish, then make layer on top with ½ of pasta, then cover that layer with ½ of Pecorino Romano. Repeat the procedure once more.



Parmigiano-Reggiano and Pecorino Romano are two cheeses that add zest to Italian meals, whether as ingredients or a condiment.

For the top 2 layers, reverse the order: first pasta, then finish with tomato sauce. Bake for 20 minutes or more until cheese is completely melted. Mix very well and serve hot.

SPAGHETTI ALLA CARBONARA

1 pound spaghetti
5 ounces pancetta (Italian bacon), diced
1 tablespoon olive oil
4 eggs
2 tablespoons heavy cream
¾ ounces freshly grated Pecorino Romano
Salt to taste
Freshly ground pepper

Yields 4 servings
Drop spaghetti into boiling salted water. Stir with wooden fork to prevent pasta from sticking. Cook for 8 to 10 minutes.
Saute pancetta in oil. In bowl, beat eggs, heavy cream,

grated cheese, salt and pepper until smooth. Drain spaghetti and transfer to warm serving bowl. Pour egg mixture and pancetta over pasta and mix thoroughly. Serve immediately.

FILETTO DI TACCHINO AL PARMIGIANO-REGGIANO

1 pound breast of turkey cut into 4 slices
1 egg, lightly beaten
1 cup bread crumbs
4 tablespoons vegetable oil
1 tablespoon butter
5 ounces Parmigiano-Reggiano cut into slivers

Yields 4 to 6 servings
Dip each turkey slice on both sides in egg and then into bread crumbs.
Heat oil in skillet over medium heat and cook turkey slices. When done, transfer to butter-smeared baking dish. Cover with Parmigiano-Reggiano and place in oven preheated to 400 F for 10 minutes.
Serve immediately.

at the same time, be exposed to a class full of ideas. It is hard to explain. But I'll try. The first day of class is the hardest. It sets a precedent. Laying down rules, so to speak. Be on time, don't miss class, ask

I wouldn't do it! I'm too busy to be teaching school again. But something keeps pulling me back — the students.

Teaching is also a learning experience. It forces me to be on my toes and

questions, be enthusiastic, and so on. After going through the syllabus and explaining how easy it is to ace my class — or to flunk (be late, don't show up, don't participate), each student gets to stand up and tell their life story. Where do you want to be in 10 years? Where do you work? What do you hope to get out of this class? What is your background?

They look at me with surprise. The information I learn in that brief time is amazing. Surprisingly, a good amount have never worked in a restaurant. The "second career" students are astonishing. This term a nurse, a carpenter, and a policeman come to mind.

A good core of the class is working in the business as cooks and managers. They are no strangers to the long hours and

hard work that is required. Each student wants to "learn as much as possible."

I hope that they keep this foremost of their memory. You only get out of school what you are willing to put in. If I could do my college years over, oh, how different they would be. Learning would be more important than a good time.

My parents told me over and over, "These are the best years of your life. Make the most of them." Little did I realize that it meant study first and play last. I guess that is part of being young. In fact, I wish I could be so carefree now. Very little responsibility was required.

Every student but one wants to own their own restaurant. As one of them put it, "then I can make my own schedule, come and go as I please, and sit back and

relax." If only that were the case. It just isn't that easy.

As an owner you are answerable to many different people. Purveyors, employees and customers. You are directly accountable for what happens to your business. People's jobs depend upon you. At times it can be overwhelming.

We spoke of professionalism as it relates to any job. What does it take to be successful? A good attitude, stamina, teamwork, experience, adherence to the highest standards and quality, and a willingness to learn. Being flexible, able to bend rules when needed; maintaining honesty and loyalty, traits that are an extinct breed; having an upbeat and positive outlook regardless of what is happening in your personal life; have a personal life;

pursuing interests other than those that involve work; being happy with yourself. The class was a nice reminder for me of the needed traits.

I presume that I stirred some brain cells. There was even some excitement. And then I asked, "What are three of your good qualities? Just think for a few minutes." Blank stares returned my question.

What are three of your good qualities? Too few of us can answer the question readily. Consider spending a moment meditating an answer.

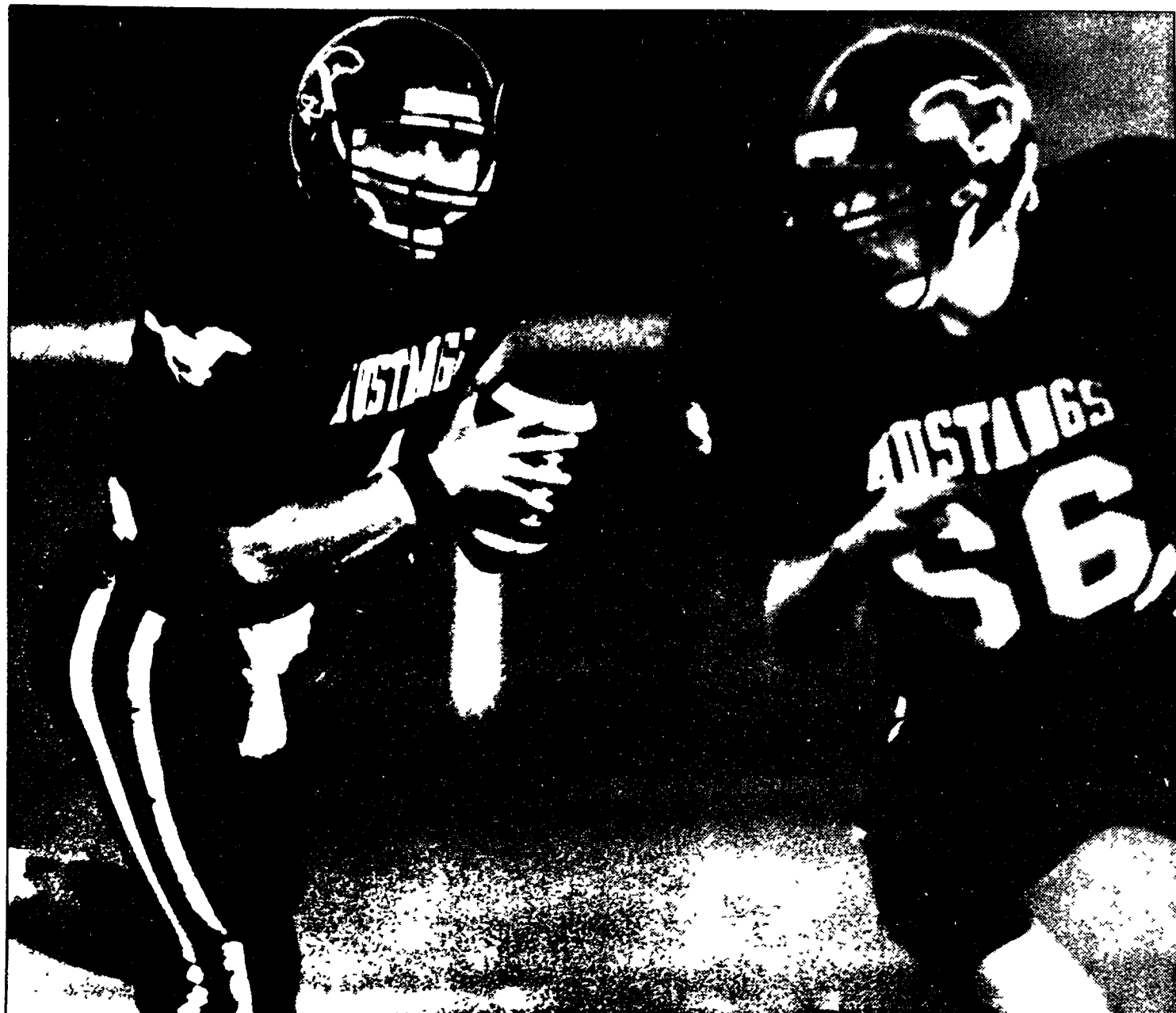

Mustangs crush Churchill 31-0

John Gatti wasn't satisfied to let his Mustang teammates on offense do all the running against Livonia Churchill Friday night.

So the 6-foot-1 defensive end roamed the field tirelessly and helped steamroll the Chargers 31-0 before a large home crowd. The junior collected six tackles for losses, including a pair of quarterback sacks.

"I thought he played exceptionally well," said Northville coach Darrel Schumacher. "Nobody runs at him. But when they did tonight, he met the challenge."

Gatti totaled 10 tackles in the game and was a main factor in shutting down Churchill. The Chargers managed just 71 yards on offense as Northville dominated the line of scrimmage.

The Mustangs also proved they can run the football on offense. Kevin Shaw, Rob Subotich and Marc Golden combined for 224 yards on the ground and scored three touchdowns in the process. Northville averaged a whopping eight yards per carry.

Schumacher credited the work of his line, with players such as Jim Conklin, Fred Swarthout, John Wilds, Erik Hibbler and Dave Eckert, for the excellent running game.

"We got real good line-surge the whole game," he said.

The coach tried hard, but couldn't come up with any downside to the game (except for a faulty head set).

"You have to be pleased with a shutout because we had given up a ton on defense in the first two games," Schumacher commented.

"We kept our assignments tonight and the kids were doing what they are supposed to do."

Northville gave up 34 points in each of its first two games against South Lyon and Walled Lake Central.

The Mustangs are now 2-1 on the season and 1-0 in the Western Divi-

sion of the Western Lakes Activities Association. Schumacher said his team is progressing.

"We are making a climb," he observed. "I see in them a desire to improve."

"They are working very hard at it." Both teams did a yeoman's job on defense in the early going.

Northville took the opening kickoff and marched to Churchill's 22-yard line before losing the ball on a fumble. Livonia took over but could do nothing with the Mustang defense as Gatti got his first sack on a Charger third down play to force a punt.

The teams traded possessions before Northville could break the ice.

The Mustangs started on their own 48-yard-line with 2:40 remaining in the first quarter. A 12-yard pass completion to Eric Shaw from quarterback Danny Walsh put Northville into Charger territory.

Subotich then carried for 12 more yards to the Livonia 28-yard-line. On second down, Walsh dropped back to pass, scrambled to his left and found Kevin Shaw in the middle of the end zone for a touchdown. An extra point attempt failed and Northville led 6-0 at the 1:39 mark.

It was all downhill for Churchill from there.

The Mustangs took their next possession on Livonia's 43-yard line and moved to the 29 after a roughing the passer call. Subotich broke numerous tackles on the next play for a 29-yard TD run. A two-point conversion at 9:58 ended scoring in the half and Northville led 14-0.

The Mustangs needed just 13 plays to add 17 points in the second half.

The Mustangs final points came in the fourth.

Placekicker Mike Hirvala capped an eight-play drive with a 25-yard field goal at 11:19. With time winding down Northville made it 31-0 as junior Golden cruised for a 57-yard touchdown run.

Youthful energy charges CMA Awards

CMA Awards founder Hall of Fame nominee

Country music is more popular than it's ever been, as is evident from runaway record sales and growing concert attendance. Younger performers and audiences have brought a higher energy level into the industry, and the Country Music Association shows its gratitude when *The 26th Annual CMA Awards* airs Wednesday, Sept. 30, on CBS.

The two-hour event, which originates from the Grand Ole Opry House in Nashville, Tenn., pairs returning host Reba McEntire with first-timer Vince Gill at the podium. Both are "Entertainer of the Year" nominees. Among the artists slated to perform at the ceremony are Mary-Chapin Carpenter, Alan Jackson and Trisha Yearwood.

The executive producer for the event, Irving Waugh, has been at the helm of the CMA Awards since its inception in 1967. With music

publisher Jack Stapp, Waugh persuaded NBC's Kraft Music Hall to televise the ceremony for the first time in 1968. Waugh, a visionary who was instrumental in the development of the Opryland entertainment complex and Nashville's first television station (WSM-TV), credits the burgeoning of country music to its increasing appeal to younger listeners.

"The Garth Brooks, for example, are bringing much younger audiences to country music," Waugh says. "I attended a Garth Brooks concert in Dallas, and I was amazed at the large percentage of teenagers."

Waugh also believes technological progress has widened the country-music audience. "This world of ours is not urban and rural anymore because of communications, because of television. We're closer to being one as far as taste."

Waugh calls on his showbiz savvy

when asked to name some of the hottest contenders in this year's awards show. "Travis Tritt (tied with Vince Gill for the lead in nominations with five each) has a tremendous youth appeal. Mary-Chapin Carpenter is a totally different artist but very attractive and writes some interesting material.

"A phenomenon, of course, is the Billy Ray Cyrus thing," Waugh continues. "Many people think he's just a flash in the pan, but many people thought Elvis (Presley) was a flash in the pan or that the Beatles wouldn't last. So I'd be slow to say that Billy Ray wouldn't be here next year."

Cyrus' megahit, "Achy Breaky Heart," which was composed by Don Von Tress, is nominated for three awards: Single of the Year, Music Video of the Year and Song of the Year. Though the song is a popular dance tune in country-music nightclubs, it is up against some tough competition in the last category, including Mary-Chapin Carpenter's "Down at the Twist & Shout," Travis Tritt's "Here's a Quarter (Call Someone Who Cares)" and "Don't Rock the Jukebox," penned by Alan Jackson, Roger Murrah and Keith Stegall.

Every third year of the Awards, the CMA Hall of Fame inducts a non-entertainer into its ranks. In 1992, Waugh is one of the five nominees for the honor. With a blend of modesty and pragmatism, Waugh, who is the namesake of the annual Irving Waugh Award of Excellence, observes that "There's one gal (BMI's Frances Preston) against four old men, so my guess is the gal will get the award, which is fine."

Waugh, a man who mentions his wartime interview of Gen. Douglas MacArthur as one of the high points of his long and illustrious career, has a matter-of-fact attitude about his many achievements. "If you live long enough," Waugh says, "you have some highlights in your life."

Sci-Fi comes to cable TV

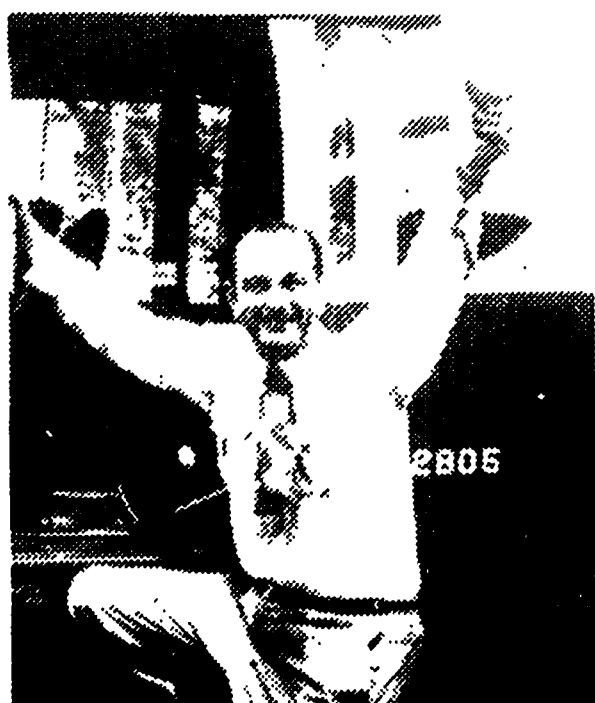

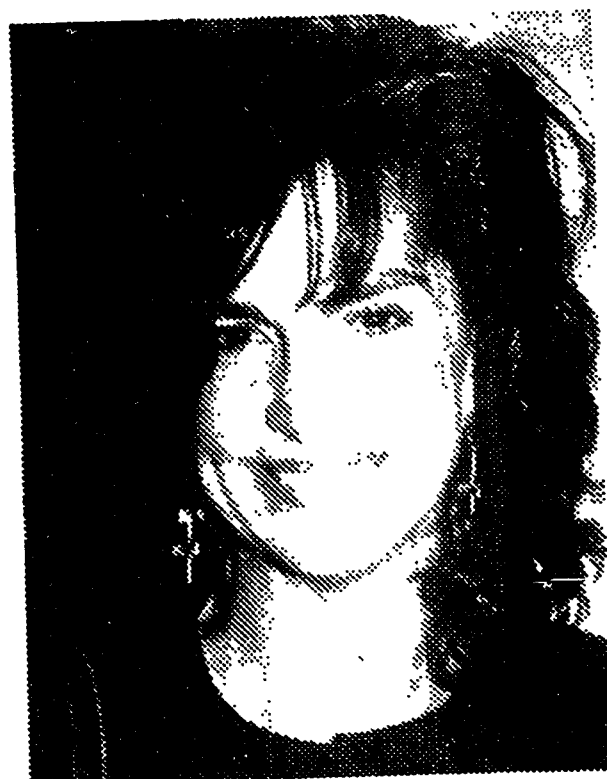
They know how to trick the baby sitter into letting them stay up until midnight, and they even know about the birds and bees long before mom and dad get around to spilling the facts. But further from home, the world is much more difficult to conquer.

News for Kids, TBS' latest endeavor to help children understand the big picture, begins in syndication on Saturday, Sept. 26, then debuts on the cable superchannel the following day.

Pre-adolescents, who may have a faint grasp of worldwide headlines and indeed may not care, can enjoy cartoons for a few more years. 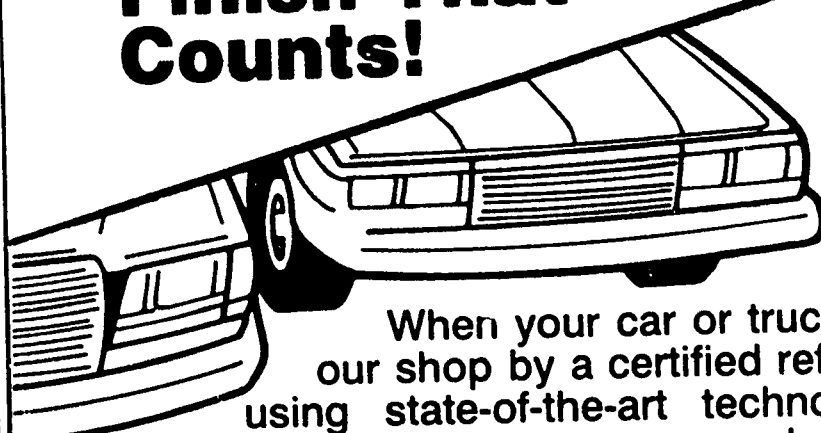

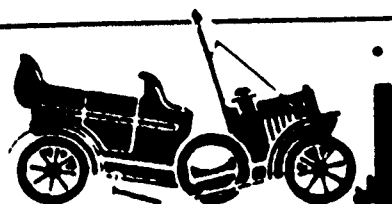

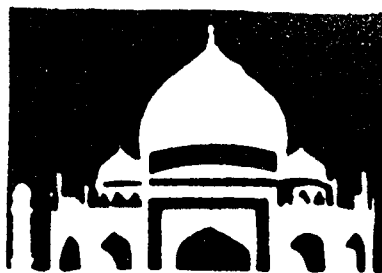

Hearts Afire

Washington, D.C. Ritter is a divorced father of two whose ex-wife has shackled up with her female therapist, while Post is a globe-trotting journalist who frequently mixes business with pleasure. She's also an outspoken feminist, but Bloodworth-Thomason's sympathies are such that she can find no better way to represent her character's irritating side than to make her a chain smoker, and irritating she certainly is.

Down on her luck, Post begs Ritter, a

top aide to an aged, out-of-fashion Southern senator (if you guess Strom Thurmond, you've got the picture), to hire her as a press assistant. Somehow, she and the elderly black woman (Beah Richards) who raised her end up living with him, too.

Also starring are Billy Bob Thornton as Ritter's good ol' boy best friend and co-worker and Beth Broderick as the senator's mistress, a bimbo with something to say for herself.

Though Bloodworth-Thomason calls Post and Ritter "the sexiest couple on television" and is eager to hurry their relationship along, there is a sleaziness to this nascent affair that makes the viewer something of a voyeur. But that's a quality that will hardly stand in the way of *Hearts Afire* becoming a hit.

Love and War (CBS) – ★★★★★

Among the dozens of scenes of romantic seduction in this season's pilots, only one involves a discussion of safe sex. Susan Dey (*L.A. Law*, *The Partridge Family*) and Jay Thomas (*Murphy Brown*) play those cautious lovers in *Love and War*, a new Monday-night comedy from *Murphy Brown* creator Diane English.

A nimble comedian, Dey plays a just-divorced New York restaurateur who stumbles out of the courthouse and into a seedy bar that is a favorite of the city's journalists, including opinion columnist Thomas. Borrowing a stage device, English allows each to turn away from the action and tell the audience what they're thinking. By degrees, we see Dey and Thomas become attracted to one another – and consider the consequences. Future meetings are assured when Dey impulsively buys the bar, then hires the former owner (John Hancock) to manage it.

With superlative writing and a well-chosen cast, English makes falling in love the second time look much the best of all.

Tuesday

Class of '96 (Fox) – ★★★

Fox intends to become a seven-night-

a-week network with the introduction of two light dramas, *Class of '96* and *Key West*, in late October.

Among this fall's pretty-faced ensemble shows, *Class of '96* stands out for its attempts to put substance in its characters' lives. Jason Gedrick (*Iron Eagle*, *Backdraft*) stars as David Morrissey, a kid from a working-class family whose love of ideas has led him to Ivy League Havenhurst College. His fellow freshmen include Brandon Douglas (*Ferris Bueller*), Lisa Dean Ryan (*Doogie Howser, M.D.*), Perry Moore (*For Richer, For Poorer*) and Gale Hansen, a 33-year-old former student of acting coach Sanford Meisner. To its discredit, fictional Havenhurst has only good-looking, non-geeky students, few blacks, and no Asians or Hispanics.

Class of '96 strives to have the writing of *thirtysomething*, but it has one of the stars instead. Series consultant Peter Horton is co-star and director of the pilot, which has more the feel of an intellectual journey than a mating dance – but only just barely. Producer Leonard Goldberg (*Family*) wants to show that "it's good to learn and it's okay to be smart," and, to a greater extent than most, he succeeds. His task now is to improve on that beginning.

All's right with CBS' 'Love and War'

English's second series
a hit not to miss

While some TV producers are fond of saying they're making "a little movie" every week, Diane English is not among these cultural effete. English, the award-winning creator of *Murphy Brown* and the target of election-year criticism for her characters' lack of "family values," is bringing a new comedy to CBS on Monday, Sept. 21.

But don't think of the premiere of English's *Love and War* as a TV show or even a movie. Think of it as an evening at the theater.

Set in Manhattan, *Love and War* has a Gershwin theme and the feel of a sophisticated, 1930s romantic comedy. It features Susan Dey as a just-divorced restaurateur and Jay Thomas as an opinion columnist and 42-year-old bachelor. Despite their differences and their mutual fear of new disappointments in romance, the pair begin to fall in love.

To give us a glimpse of her main characters' souls, English employs the common stage device of having them turn and speak to the audience — or in this case, the camera.

But besides such calculated theatrical elements, the one-hour premiere episode plays like a play because it was filmed that way — in one pass, with no time for retakes, extra camera angles or flubbed lines. The live-on-film effect was a child of necessity: After a 10-day rehearsal schedule and a day's delay due to union negotiations with the crew, the pilot had to be shot on the first evening of curfew during last spring's Los Angeles riots. Otherwise, English would have lost two of her actors — Dey and co-star Michael Nouri — to other commitments.

"At about two o'clock in the afternoon, the manager of the lot that we were shooting on came to us and said, 'We're evacuating the lot, and you must all go home.'"

"There was no way we could postpone. So Joel (Shukovsky, English's husband and co-producer) negotiated for us, and they allowed us to shoot our show, only one pass, at 4 p.m. At 6:30, everyone had to be in their cars going home."

Even their planned studio audience

was unavailable. But a tour bus of 40 teenagers (some with Super Soakers) turned away from *The Dennis Miller Show* was located in time.

"They weren't the people that we expected to respond to our show," English continues, "and yet we got a wonderful response from them."

Besides Thomas' Jack Stein and Dey's Wally Porter, the cast includes Suzie Plakson as Meg, an acerbic sports writer; John Hancock as Ike, the owner of journalists' watering hole The Blue Shamrock; Joel Murray as a sanitation worker who feels at home in the seedy hangout; and Nouri as Dey's ex-husband, a narcissistic actor. Future episodes will include Joanna Gleason as a suburban housewife hired as a Blue Shamrock waitress.

"So we went ahead. There's some bouncy camera work here and there that we'll live with. But we kind of considered it a small miracle and are looking forward to going on from there."

"From there" includes the development of both the romance and The Blue Shamrock, which Wally buys on a kind of self-imposed dare to prove to herself and the world that she's still a success. (Her first place, Chez Wally, had to be sold in the divorce settlement.)

With top-notch writing and acting, and a premium Monday-night time slot, *Love and War*, Wally and Jack and The Blue Shamrock should all be long-running hits.

Balfour followed acting dream early

Fifteen-year-old Eric Balfour is definitely stage-struck. But at an age when many would-be actors are trying out for the school musical, Balfour is hoping his network series will get renewed for midseason.

The son of a chiropractor, Balfour got his first taste of theater when his mother took him to a touring production of *Cats*. By the time he was in fifth grade, he had won a part in a school production of *Uncle Tom's Cabin*. These days, he takes acting, singing and dancing lessons four afternoons a week.

This spring, after several seasons on the children's variety show *Kids, Inc.*, Balfour decided to take a chance on an ABC summer comedy, *Arresting Behavior*. The seven-episode series, airing Wednesdays, is shot with a hand-held camera, giving it the feel of a home movie. It focuses on a middle-age policeman (Leo Burmeister), his colleagues and his family. Balfour plays Burmeister's son, Billy. Evidently, the two actors have formed an off-screen bond as well: In typical teen parlance, Balfour calls Burmeister "the coolest guy."

While the crime-fighting scenes usually involve over-the-edge behavior by the officers, Balfour's young character is frequently getting into jams of the adolescent kind.

"He's kind of a moody kid," Balfour notes, "and gets into a lot of trouble — he's very self-conscious."

Hercules no kin to Superman; looking for a moving Van?

Q: Could you please tell me if Christopher Reeves (sic), who plays Superman in all the movies, is any kin to George Reeves, who played Superman in the television series The Adventures of Superman? —Michelle Strickland, Benton, Ark.

A: Superman is quite a topic of interest among the readers of this column, including Shirley Baldasaro of Claremont, N.H., and Ginger Lowe of Oakley, Idaho, and I will attempt to answer all your questions.

The most recent *Superman* movies starred Christopher Reeve, therefore making his relation to George Reeves not only unlikely, but untrue. A few readers have even wondered if the modern Man of Steel is related to Steve Reeves, who many also mistakenly believe played Superman. Steve Reeves is an actor best known for his portrayal of another strongman, Hercules.

George Reeves did star in *The Adventures of Superman*, which made him a big star, and, perhaps at the same time, hopelessly typecast him to the point that no one would accept him in any other role. Though he had appeared in great films like *Gone With the Wind*, *Rancho Notorious* and *From Here to Eternity*, the trauma of being forever identified with a cartoon character supposedly led to his suicide in 1959. Singer/songwriter Don McLean ("American Pie") has begun a personal vigil in an attempt to prove Reeves did not kill himself and may have been murdered. He's also written a song on the subject.

Q: I really like the voice of the Crypt-Keeper on Tales From the Crypt. Can you tell me his name and address so I can write him a letter? —Rachel Boyer, Condon, Ore.

A: Designed by ghoulish guru Kevin Yagher, the caustic Crypt-Keeper, who opens each segment of the popular HBO anthology series, is voiced by John Kassir. You may write to Kassir in care of The Gersh Agency, 232 Canon Drive, Beverly Hills, Calif., 90210.

Q: I am a great fan of all Westerns and have on videotape over 500 movies,

but only four of my favorite Western actor, Clint Walker. I know he made more than those four movies, and that is why I am asking how I can write to Mr. Walker and ask him what other movies he made. —Tony Gaik, Sedona, Ariz.

A: Walker is best known for his title role in the TV Western series *Cheyenne*, a part he reprised in the 1991 miniseries *The Gambler Returns: The Luck of the Draw*. A list of his film credits includes: *Fort Dobbs* (1958), *Yellowstone Kelly* (1959), *The Night of the Grizzly* (1966), *The Dirty Dozen* (1967), *Yuma* (1970), *The Bounty Man* (1972), *Pancho Villa* (1972), *Snowbeast* (1977) and *White Buffalo* (1977). I'm sure you'll still want to write Walker, and you may do so in care of First Artists Agency, 10000 Riverside Dr., Ste. 6, Toluca Lake, Calif., 91602.

Q: Can you please tell me the name of a movie with Van Johnson and Jane Wyman (I think)? He goes off to war and dies holding a medallion that she gave him. He comes back (from the dead) to see her, but no one believes her until they see she has the medallion in her hand. —Brandy Rice, Carthage, Texas.

A: The picture of which you write is 1956's *Miracle in the Rain*. Incidentally, bridging the hereafter must have been a favorite theme of Johnson's. He played in the similarly moving films *The End of the Affair* and *A Guy Named Joe*, the latter of which was remade in 1989 as *Always*.

Grant's latest character is a far cry from the sleazy guys he played in the past, and he equates the new role with a Clint Eastwood-type of character.

It was an interesting summer on daytime, and things are shaping up to make the fall season stimulating.

No dry remarks here. Adding to *Murphy Brown*'s recent Emmy win, the show's "On the Rocks" episode has won the 1992 Scott Newman Drug Abuse Prevention Award for best comedy program.

Super Bowl of tennis or net gain of \$500,000?

The court is in session – the tennis court, that is. On Friday, Sept. 25, the two winningest tennis players in the history of the game will play each other in a contest dubbed the "Duel of the Decade." Martina Navratilova will face Jimmy Connors in a three-set match at Caesar's Palace in Las Vegas, with the winner to take home \$500,000.

Promoters are calling this event the "Battle of the Champions." In 1973, the match between tennis champ Billy Jean King and male chauvinist Bobby Riggs was given the title "Battle of the Sexes," and rightfully so. King was out to prove a point – that a woman could defeat a man in athletic competition. Her match against Riggs held great significance for women, and, from the moment she trounced Riggs, men had to think twice before making a disparaging remark about female athletes.

One has to wonder about the significance of the Connors-Navratilova match. If Connors does beat Navratilova, will women lose respect in the athletic world? Not likely. Her winning record alone should guarantee her place in tennis history. By the same token, Connors' record as the winningest male to play the game should not be overshadowed by a Sept. 25 loss.

Times have changed. Motivations have changed. In 1973, the motivation was proving the point that female athletes were a force to be dealt with. The motivation this time seems to be money.

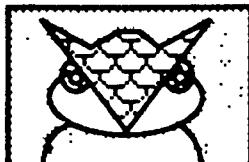

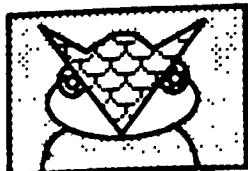
