Drug suspects will face trial

A district court judge on Friday refused to dismiss marijuana possession charges against Todd Patrick Bonner, one of two youths whose arrests sparked a Sept. 17 police raid of an alleged drug dealer's Northville home.

Visiting 35th District Court Judge John McCartney rejected defense attorney Harold Gurewitz's request to dismiss charges against Bonner, 20, of Taylor, during a preliminary examination.

Bonner and co-defendant Timothy Brian Braun, 19, of Allen Park, were ordered bound over for arraignment

on information and pretrial examination Oct. 16 at the Frank Murphy Hall of Justice in Detroit.

Earlier Friday, Braun waived his preliminary examination at 35th District Court.

Gurewitz had asked the judge to throw out charges against his client, saying Bonner had nothing to do with Braun's earlier purchase of one pound of marijuana.

"The evidence fails to show anything other than presence in the vehicle," Gurewitz said. "There is absolutely no evidence that Mr. Bonner did anything whatsoever to assist the activities of Mr. Braun."

But McCartney disagreed, and sided with Assistant Wayne County

Prosecutor Gary LaBret, who said Bonner accompanied Braun on the drug buy because Braun reportedly was afraid to pull off the deal alone.

LaBret also said a remark made by Bonner at the scene of a traffic stop indicated that he was aware the illegal drug was in the vehicle.

"(Bonner) said, 'Take the ticket' (to Braun)," LaBret said. "(It was) a conscious effort by Mr. Bonner to attempt to advise him to (conceal) the contraband."

Bonner reportedly told Braun to accept a traffic violation without argument, rather than attract police scrutiny which could lead to a search of Braun's vehicle.

Township police officer John

Werth had stopped Braun's car late Sept. 16 for a traffic violation. Werth testified Friday that Braun's array of pricey jewelry, portable telephone, and beeper seemed out of line for a youth who claimed to be employed by a lawn maintenance service.

Werth said he asked Braun if police could search his vehicle, a request Braun reportedly okayed. But Braun supposedly changed his mind when police asked to look in the car's trunk.

"He said, 'No' and was really nervous, really shaken," Werth said.

A speaker system in the car's hatchback area reportedly gave officer

Residents vent frustration at group meeting

Anger directed at school officials marked Wednesday night's first meeting of Advocates for Quality Education.

"I was surprised at the level of hostility," said Advocates President Mike Hasler. "And I'm concerned that there's that much of it. If I were a school board member I would be deeply concerned."

Once Hasler finished his introduction at the meeting, he turned the floor over to the audience to hear their comments and concerns. What followed was a litany of residents' complaints and frustrations about how the School Board and the administration have conducted business this year. For nearly two hours, residents and Advocates members aired their gripes. They talked about the fo

Officials defend information flow

Contrary to the complaints people had at the Advocates for Quality Education meeting Wednesday, school officials said they have honored all the requests for information they've received from residents.

The suspicion that residents weren't getting a straight story from school officials about finances and budget items arose during the two millage campaigns earlier this year. After the June 8 defeat, those suspicions magnified into complaints which reared their heads at Wednesday night's first open meeting of Advocates.

Residents who attended the meeting criticized the School Board and the administration for what they perceived as the officials' blatant attempt to withhold information or stonewall them from getting information about school programs and district finances. Several members of the crowd who complained to Advocates about the problem said their repeated requests for copies of 1992-93 line item budget have been unanswered or denied.

Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski, Business Manager John Street, and School Board President Carol Rahimi dispute that.

"Everyone who has requested information has a right to it. Whether or not we can give it to them in a manner that they understand is a different matter, but it's not a credibility prob

lem for us if they can't understand it," Rezmierski said.

"On the budget issue I am quite aware of two people who requested that information. One person has already talked with (Finance Director) John Street on numerous occasions and the other has all the information he requested," he said.

Rezmierski said the people who have requested copies of the line-item budget have been told they can have the current budget, which was passed in July, or wait until the updated version comes out Oct. 12.

The revised version, Rezmierski said, is more reflective of the current figures and takes into consideration all the last-minute personnel changes and expenses tied to the opening of the school year.

That budget will be reviewed by the school district's finance subcommittee on Wednesday, Oct. 7 at 7:30 p.m. in the Main Street school conference room. After that it will go to the full board on Oct. 12. Copies of it will be available for residents at that meeting, Rezmierski said.

He said district officials have encouraged people to wait until the revised budget comes out so they get the most recent information.

"John is preparing and will deliver to the board and to the public on the 12th the updated quarterly report. That's when we will give you the updated version, because it will be cur

Paper earns several awards in recent contests

The Northville Record has won the title of "Michigan's Best" newspaper in its division for the second straight year.

The Record won 10 awards in the Michigan Press Association's 1992 Better Newspaper Contest, the MPA announced last week. In addition, the paper took one honor in the recently announced Suburban Newspaper Association contest.

The MPA judges named the Record "Michigan's Best" in its class — weeklies and twice-weeklies between 5,000 and 15,000 circulation — based on the number of other awards the paper earned. The Record was also named "Michigan's Best" last year.

The paper's other MPA awards were: second place in General Excellence; first place in Local News Reporting, for Steve Kellman's piece "In the Winner's Circle"; second place in Use of Graphics; second place in Use of Color; first place in Editorial

Page or Pages; second place in Feature Picture, for a Bryan Mitchell shot taken during the weeklong stay of a group of homeless people at First United Methodist Church; second place in Picture Story, for Mitchell's page looking at the Northville High School prom from the perspective of one attendee; first place in Sports Coverage, for sections written and edited by Neil Geoghegan and Scott Daniel; and first place in Lifestyle/Family Section (the "Our Town" section, written and edited by Cristina Ferrier).

In the SNA contest, covering suburban papers throughout North America, the Record won first place in editorial writing for entries submitted by reporter Mike Tyree and editor Bob Needham.

The Record's sister paper, the Novi News, also fared well. It won eight awards from the MPA and two from the SNA. Two of the MPA honors were for articles which also appeared in the Record: second place in Local News Reporting for Kellman and Suzanne Hollier's expose of a prostitution operation

running out of a home off Eight Mile Road, and first place in Picture Story for Hal Gould's "Ladies of the Manor" photos taken at Star Manor on Main Street.

The News' other MPA awards were first place in General Excellence; second place in Spot or Breaking News; third place for Local News Reporting, third place in Local Columns to Managing Editor Michael Malott; third place in Spot News Picture to Mitchell; and honorable mention in Lifestyle/Family Section.

In the SNA contest, the News won second place in Special Sections and third place in Breaking News.

Both papers are published by HomeTown Newspapers. Other HomeTown publications recognized by the MPA were The Brighton Argus and The Milford Times, each with seven awards; The South Lyon Herald, with four; and the Livingston County Press, with two.

CITY CHANGES RECYCLING CENTER HOURS: The city council recently voted to reduce business hours at the Northville City recycling center, located inside the Department of Public Works yard at 650 Doherty Drive. The recycling center will no longer be open Wednesdays between 3-7 p.m. Weekend hours will be cut from every Saturday to the first and third Saturdays of each month, between 11 a.m.-5 p.m.

The move is due to reduced use of the center since the city initiated curbside collection of recycling materials, and is intended to reduce the need for overtime by DPW workers. Since curbside recycling started in February, average use of the center has dropped to 35 cars on Wednesdays and 55 cars on Saturdays.

The center is available to City of Northville residents only, and identification is checked at the gate.

The center accepts clear, green and brown glass, plastic types 1 and 2, tin cans, household and car batteries, paint, used motor oil and antifreeze, compost material, scrap metal, and newspapers. Liquids should be in sealed, clearly labeled containers. Newspapers should be stacked in brown paper bags or tied into bundles. Telephone books, magazines and road maps are not accepted.

Residents talk about frustrations

cus of their group and an agenda members hoped would solve what they see as a communication dilemma between themselves and school officials.

After hearing what Advocates was all about, 25 residents paid their \$10 membership fee and signed on as new Advocates. That brings the total dues-paying membership to 85.

Hasler was encouraged to see the response Advocates received. He said it further reinforces the need for the group.

"Basically what this is saying is that if we were satisfied completely with the information we were receiving from the board and the administration, why would we have spent so many hours putting this thing together?"

Spokespeople for Advocates said the group emerged over the summer after its members felt as though they were being cheated out of information about school finances and other educational issues from school board members and administrators. Advocates claim the hostility and anger some residents feel now toward school officials stems from the defeat of the two millage-hike campaigns and the absence of credible information available to the community from the schools.

As if to add insult to injury, what fueled some of the fire Wednesday was who was making the comments. Speaking out against some of the board and administrative actions were Greg Purtell, a member of the school district's Strategic Planning Committee; Sharon Ferrara, the president of the PTA Coordinating Council, and others like Irene Fleming, who has served on various study

committees for the district.

Each stood up and said there have been problems with the dissemination of information in the past, but they all said they were willing to back Advocates' position.

Purtell said the politics that surrounded the millage campaigns and the cuts that followed turned his head about school officials.

"I voted yes for the renewal and for the increase," he said. "I did it because I knew what they would do without that money. They did it (made budget cuts), and they did it even worse than I thought they would."

"I want the board to know that when they come back this spring for a millage—and they will—they better show me what they've done to deserve it. Right now they don't have my vote next June. They'll have to earn it."

Purtell's comments were indicative of the crowd's mood at the meeting. Several stood to vent anger and frustration. They cited morale problems and class sizes at the high school, administrative costs and teachers' contracts, budget cuts and their impact on the curriculum, and the overall attitudes of teachers, administrators and students.

But what was the most prevalent was the charge of unresponsiveness of school officials to honor requests for information.

"I've asked several times for a copy of the line-item budget and have been refused," said Jack Iwema, a township resident. "I'm concerned about the lack of information and why it takes nothing short of a court order to get that information."

Iwema's comments were supported by a handful of residents who say they've requested a line-item

budget from the district and have yet to receive it.

"I'm here because I can't get information from the School Board," said Moraine Elementary parent Debbie Faber. "They can't produce it for us. . . . What you get from them is a very condescending attitude."

Hasler said he expected residents to come to the meeting armed with their concerns, but said he was concerned about all the dissension.

"One of the concerns we all heard was that we had some people who thought the meeting was too negative. We are concerned about that, only because we want to be sure we are a positive organization," Hasler said.

"That doesn't always mean we are going to be all positive or all negative. We are going to be objective and balanced. But there are some things going on in this district that are good, and we need to address those too."

Ferrara backed him up and defended her own position as well.

"Yes, I'm involved," she said. "And I have been for seven years. I am not here to say that everything is perfect; I wouldn't be here if that were true."

"We know there needs to be input. But if we keep harping on the negative and never seeing the positives, we'll never be a community again."

In spite of the sentiment of the first meeting, Hasler said the group hopes to take a positive approach to solve the problems.

"I do not want to make light of people's concerns. If they have those concerns, they must be addressed. But we hope to address those concerns in a very positive way. I hope we can proceed with a very balanced, objective approach."

His commitment to objectivity came under fire from some of the au-

dience members who questioned past ties of some Advocates to the now-defunct, millage-support group Citizens for Quality Education.

Hasler found himself defending the membership as a means of building credibility with potential members. He attempted to lay to rest the issue of the collective membership's past and present affiliations with school groups and CQE.

"There is no question that there is some overlap," Hasler said about the ties between CQE and Advocates. "But now there's a new environment and there are some things that need to be looked at. The administration and the School Board have had nothing to do with this organization."

That issue troubled Carlos Raiz, who questioned the need for yet another school-oriented citizens group in the community.

"Why do we need another group? Why couldn't we get these things done through CQE or the PTA groups?" he asked.

Raiz cornered Hasler and the other members of the steering committee and asked them to differentiate their agenda from other groups in the community.

"I don't want to belong to a group that is not going to do something about a Board of Education that I can't trust my daughter's education with," he said.

To that and the other comments, Hasler said Advocates intends to persevere on educational issues.

"We can't guarantee the board will do what we want them to, but I guess the leverage we all have is that we are the voters," he said.

rent. The line items will be there and it will be exact."

Reznierski said he has no way of tracking down the other complaints that were leveled against the School Board and the administration Wednesday night without having specific examples from which to work. He speculated some of the issues raised at the Advocates meeting were spurred from people's reactions to isolated incidents with school officials.

"Obviously, people don't like the cut of the job of somebody or don't like they way they said it or they were offended by the manner. That all is ob-

viously the human condition.

"But not getting the information, that's a different story. Not getting it the way you want it, that's a different matter. But not getting access to information has got to be absolutely unfounded."

Business Manager John Street concurred.

Street said he has had numerous requests made for budget information, more so this year than in years past. But he too said he's responded to all the calls he's received for budget information.

"I have told people that I have a budget I can give them, but if they want one that is more reflective they should wait until October (12). Out of

the three or four calls I've taken, everyone has gotten the information or they said, 'Fine, I'll wait.'"

Street said he's either mailed people a copy of the current budget or, if they wanted to wait until the updated version was printed, he agreed to mail it to them then.

"With school starting in September, the state does not require a budget until mid-October, when the pupil counts are in and things like the teachers and transportation and all these things are settled," he said.

Board President Carol Rahimi was confused and frustrated after hearing the comments made at the meeting. She said administrators are doing their best to process all the re-

quests amid trying to get school open.

"I do think that Len and John have tried to get information out as fast as they can," she said. "But the requests are so numerous and coming at the time when we are trying to get school open. There are only so many hours in the day."

Rahimi said she was unaware of the residents' concerns because they had not contacted her at all.

"I have not heard directly from these people that spoke the other night at the meeting, but I would be glad to answer any questions they have," she said.



Fire Safety

Foam is an important tool in controlling spills

The tanker truck driver was in the process of unloading his cargo at a local service station when something went wrong. The connection between the hose leading to the underground storage tank and the side of the tanker came loose and, coupled with a failure in one of the tanker's valves, the result was a steady stream of gasoline gushing from the side of the truck. By the time the flow was stopped several hundred gallons of the flammable liquid had spilled onto the pavement. It took a couple of minutes to realize the extent of the problem. Before too long, however, the service station manager realized that cleaning up the spill would be no easy job. And, in the meantime, the gasoline laying around her station presented a dangerous fire hazard should a carelessly discarded cigarette or other ignition source reached the vapors that were already rising from the spill. A call to 911 brought help from the fire department.

The first arriving fire personnel radioed dispatch to advise of the extent of the spill. Firefighters quickly worked to contain the spill, erecting dikes around nearby catch basins and diverting the spill from a small creek that ran behind the service station property, to prevent contamination of the sewers and waterways. In the meantime, the service station manager, following established procedures, called a specialized hazardous waste cleanup company to clean up the spill. It would be several hours before the cleanup company's equipment and personnel could arrive at the scene, and in the meantime the risk of fire presented by the spill remained high. The fire chief consulted with the station manager and, by cellular phone, with a technical representative of the clean up company. The decision was then made to apply a protective blanket of foam over the spill to help reduce the danger of fire until the spill could be cleaned up. Water is the most commonly used substance to extinguish fires. For some fires, however, water is of little use. Fires in flammable liquids, such as gasoline, are not easily extinguished by water. Indeed, in some cases heavy

applications of water merely serve to move the burning fluid around, with little or no extinguishing effect. Gasoline and other hydrocarbons will also "float" on water, so that application of water to a spill does nothing to prevent the spill from igniting. As early as the late 19th century dry chemical foams were developed to help address this problem. By the 1930s liquid foam concentrates were available which, when mixed with water, provided a "blanket" that served to smother fires in materials such as hydrocarbons. Today, a variety of foam products are produced for fire fighting applications, depending on the nature of the material involved and the equipment available for its application. Virtually all fire fighting foams rely upon a mixture of foam concentrate, usually in a 3 percent or 6 percent solution, with water and air. Perhaps the most widely used foam today is "aqueous film forming foam" or "AFFF" (pronounced "A triple F"). This is a synthetic based "dual action" foam. In addition to forming a thick blanket of foam bubbles across the surface of the burning material, AFFF also produces an aqueous film which is self-healing; that is, it will reform

even if disturbed by agitation in the flammable liquid which it covers. AFFF also requires little in the way of specialized equipment, making applications easier. At the scene of the tanker spill, firefighters established a water supply and set up an in-line inductor with a five gallon container of 3 percent AFFF foam. Using a fog nozzle at the end of the hose line, a fire fighter laid down foam on the pavement in front of the gasoline spill, and "rolled" the foam over the surface of the flammable liquid until the entire surface was covered. The foam blanket quickly suppressed the fumes which earlier had been rising from the spill, reducing the risk of accidental fire. The Fire Department stood by at the scene, with foam equipment in place, while the clean-up company soaked up the spill with specialized absorbent materials. Fortunately, it did not become necessary to use the foam to actually extinguish a fire. The foam had done its job in this case, preventing a fire from happening in the first place.

Legislative Action Network/Public School Funding

How are state educational tax dollars distributed?

This is the first in a series of articles provided by the Northville Council of PTA's Legislative Action Network. The articles will highlight school finance and school property tax proposals slated for the November election. We are indebted to Dr. C. Philip Kearney's excellent Primer on Michigan School Finance for substantial portions of this article.

WHY THE FORMULA In an effort to make educational funding more equitable between wealthy and poor districts, the state Legislature passed the Michigan School Aid Act in 1973. The act guaranteed substantially the same money per pupil to tax-base-poor (in-formula) districts, taxing at the same rate as wealthy (out-of-formula) districts. In theory, this means that if two districts tax at the same rate (or levy the same mills*), they would receive the same amount per pupil.

TWO SOURCES OF STATE FUNDING To achieve the equity, the School Aid Act provides that state dollars will be distributed to local districts under two systems of grants: 1. the Membership Formula Grant, and 2. The Special and Categorical Grants. All districts are eligible for Special and Categorical grants. Only in-formula districts are eligible for Membership grants.

MEMBERSHIP FORMULA GRANTS How does the state determine which districts are in-formula or out-of-formula? Using the Membership Formula section of the School Aid Act, the Legislature decides on the funding each year. School districts who are property-tax-base poor (low state equalized value or SEV), but taxing at high millage rates, will receive state aid. School districts who are property-tax-base rich (high SEV) would not receive money from the School Aid Formula. Thus, each school district is guaranteed equal money, either through local property tax or a combination of local and state funds, for each mill taxed. Using two districts as examples, we can demonstrate how the formula works. For 1992-93, the Legislature set a guaranteed flat dollar amount at \$342 per pupil plus \$96.29 per pupil for each mill levied for operating purposes. (Operating millage is millage used for day-to-day operations of the school district.)

1992-93 Formula:
Flat amount (\$342)
+Per pupil per mill (\$96.29)
Maximum state aid guaranteed
-SEV per pupil
Amount of state aid

Garden City has an SEV per pupil of \$53.140, multiplied by 1 mill to equal \$53.14 in local school property taxes generated per mill.
\$53.140 x 0.001 (1 mill) = \$53.14.
Garden City (with voter approval) chooses to levy approximately 42 mills. Therefore, it would receive \$2,231.88 per pupil in local property tax.
\$53.14 x 42 mills = \$2,231.88 per pupil
Under the membership formula, the state would make up the difference between the state's guarantee and the income from local taxes.
Flat amount \$342.00
Per pupil per mill (for Garden City) \$96.29
+42 mills x \$96.29 \$4044.18
Maximum state aid guarantee 4386.18
SEV per pupil (for Garden City) 53.14
-42 mills x \$53.14 2231.88
Total state aid \$2154.30

Therefore, even though Garden City levies 42 mills, it receives state funds because its property tax base is too poor to generate enough money to meet the state's guaranteed minimum per pupil. Garden City is said to be in-formula.

And thus we see how the formula rewards those districts who are willing to tax themselves heavily, but do not have enough property value to generate the necessary revenue.
Let's see how Northville fares under the State Aid Formula. Northville's SEV per pupil is \$188,000 and levies just under 30 mills.
\$188,000 x 0.001 (1 mill) = \$188 per pupil per mill.
\$188 x 30 mills = \$5,640 per pupil
Flat amount \$342.00
Per pupil per mill (for Northville) \$96.29
+30 mills x \$96.29 \$2888.70
Maximum state aid guarantee 3230.70
SEV per pupil (for Northville) 188.00
-30 mills x \$188 5640.00
Total state aid \$(2409.30)
Thus, Northville is said to be out-of-formula because it receives no funds from the state formula.

SPECIAL AND CATEGORICAL GRANTS The other form of state aid is Special and Categorical Grants. These grants are "earmarked" monies for such school district costs as voca-

tional education, special education, gifted and talented education, pupil transportation, bilingual education and other special needs identified by the state and the Legislature. The funds cannot be used for other than the identified purpose under each grant. Northville receives some funds for K-12 special education, transportation, vocational education and employer Social Security payments. Each year the Legislature decides what items will be classified as Categorical grants. For example, in recent years, the employer's share of Social Security has been designated as Categorical. However, while out-of-formula districts, like Northville, do receive Special and Categorical grants, the Legislature "recaptures" or holds back a portion of the dollars to which the out-of-formula district would be entitled. The amount held back is based on a sliding scale related primarily to the district's wealth or SEV per pupil and a statewide cap on recapture. This is one way Northville has lost state funding in recent years.

FUNDING THE FORMULA The Michigan School Aid Act is an attempt to provide equitable educational funding for all Michigan students. The School Aid Formula has been copied by eight other states

under court mandate to find a more equitable plan for funding schools. Michigan's system works, but funding has steadily declined for 20 years. In the past, the Legislature funded 50 percent of the cost of education of Michigan's K-12 schools. Today the Legislature only funds the formula to cover 34 percent. The state has shifted its responsibility for educational funding to the local school district. As the school district examples used here demonstrate, Garden City still lags behind Northville in per-pupil spending. If the formula was fully funded, the gap between the rich and poor districts would be narrowed significantly, thus eliminating the need for "Robin Hood" plans (plans which take funds from wealthy districts and give to tax-base poor districts.) Unfortunately, the property tax proposals on the November ballot (HJR-H and Cut and Cap) do nothing to resolve the inequities and underfunding of Michigan's public schools. Please look for future articles explaining those proposals and other school funding programs. *A mill is a tax of \$1,000 of property assessment. For example, if a home has a market value of \$100,000, the assessed value or state equalized valuation (SEV) is 50 percent of that amount, or \$50,000. Therefore, a 1-mill tax on \$50,000 is \$50.

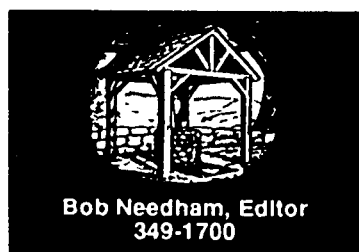

Put an end to dispute over honor society fee

By the time the School Board next takes up the National Honor Society issue and, we hope, resolves it, more than a month will have passed since the problem first cropped up.

That's way too long, particularly when the solution seems pretty clear.

School officials learned in mid-September that the newly instituted fees for co-curricular activities apparently conflict with the National Honor Society charter. Because of budget cuts, the school district this year implemented a \$100-per-semester fee for a student to participate in any number of co-curricular activities. Depending on whose estimates you listen to, roughly 30 to 50 students belong to the honor society and no other activity.

That, in effect, creates a \$100-per-semester National Honor Society membership fee for those students. However, the national society charter permits only a fee of no more than \$5. Once the national organization learned of the conflict, it sent a letter to the school district warning that Northville High School could be booted out of the organization.

Of course nobody wants that to happen, and the district has spent the past few weeks puzzling over the problem. Luckily, honor society officials haven't taken any action during that time, but we wonder how long their patience will hold out. The district needs to resolve this soon. It should have been resolved already.

The issue really isn't as complicated as it might appear. There are a few key questions to answer, and they're pretty easy

- Does Northville High School have to have a National Honor Society chapter? No, of course not. However, it most certainly should. If the district is to be considered high-quality, which it is, this chapter is a must. In addition, dropping the group altogether would be unfair to the students who deserve the honor and for whom membership in the group could be the deciding factor on getting into a preferred college.
- What, if anything, should the members be charged? If the group is to remain, a \$5 membership fee is the maximum. The district is in dire financial straits, and the program does have a cost (to pay its teacher sponsors). So charge the \$5. That obviously means the honor society cannot be considered a typical pay-to-participate activity.

● Should the district then make a single exception for the honor society, or scrap pay-to-participate altogether? We don't like the fee system at all; it feels like punishment for the failed tax-hike requests. But as we've said, for the time being it appears necessary. Abandoning it altogether would create an entirely new budget crisis, and we don't think the district could take it. So yes, the district should make a single exception.

● What about students who participate in other activities? They should pay an extra \$5 for the honor society. If the society is out of the fee structure, it's out completely, and everyone should pay the same to belong. That's not really fair, but the whole pay-to-participate structure is not fair. And it's only \$5, after all.

● But how can you justify treating one activity differently from all the rest? Because you have to. Because it is different. It's simply not the same situation as band, or yearbook, or drama, none of which are nationally sanctioned clubs with national rules.

● What about the financial implications? If 50 students enroll in the honor society and no other activity, this change would remove \$10,000 from the treasury. Using the district's own figure of 30 students, though, it drops to \$6,000, which would be offset \$500 by the \$5 fee. We have to believe there's \$5,500 to be found elsewhere in the budget, particularly when only \$1,200 of that would be subsidizing the honor society (\$1,700 sponsor cost minus \$500 membership fees). In a worst-case scenario, the district's rainy-day fund could pay the \$5,500 and not really miss it. If, as district officials fear, the rainy-day fund might be needed to offset more financial chicanery from the state Legislature, the lack of that \$5,500 isn't going to make much difference.

That's it. The reasoning seems to us pretty basic and pretty solid. School officials should act quickly to resolve this situation, before the national organization takes it out of their hands.

It was a pretty tall order since the Taste of Novi boasted 20 different eateries showcasing their wares. I was mighty impressed with the event, now in its seventh year. Of all the fund-raisers the Chamber of Commerce hosts, this one is one of the best attended, and one that diners and chefs alike look forward to.

According to Connie Mallett, executive director of the Novi Chamber of Commerce, the Taste of Novi began as a simple exhibition involving 10 local restaurants. It was a private event for Chamber members.

Now it's grown to 20 restaurants, including all the major hotels in the area. Last year's event drew 400 people. My best guess at the attendance Thursday night was closer to 500 as the Savoy Room at the Baronette was reduced to sardine-like confines at the height of the action.

Chef Bill Collins and Drew Goebel of the Sheraton Oaks were honored by the chamber for the best presentation of their food. They seized on a Halloween theme with jack o'lanterns and a 200-pound ice sculpture that held a ghostly

glow thanks to a black light projected from beneath it.

Not to ignore their food either. They put on an awesome cheese tray, some tiny tuna salad puffs, and a flavorful peanut chicken with sweet and sour sauce.

The Novi Hilton impressed with a shrimp scampi smothered with mushrooms and artichoke hearts, and also displayed artist's renderings of the Italian restaurant now being built there.

Victor's melted all the adjacent wall fixtures with its sagu-naki, the flaming Greek goat cheese, but the crowds kept coming to the siren call of "Opal"

The new Pastry Palace made its first public appearance with some fabulous creamy and chocolaty concoctions. Chuck and Ingrid Ankoński tended the table, but they proudly pointed out that son Jim was the pastry chef who created the sweet miniature masterpieces. "He learned in my kitchen when he was just a little boy," said Ingrid.

As I called for a bellhop to wheel me out to my car, I tried to choose a favorite dish. It was a tough call.

I'm a nut for Caesar salad, and Diamond Jim Brady's fixes a nice one (the real way) with gravlox on toast points on the side. The Radisson Suites also served the best red cabbage I've ever tasted (if only grandma had had this recipe when I was a kid).

But if there was a dish I'd walk over hot coals (or even flaming goat cheese) to have, well, it's a tie: Key Largo's Grand Marnier shrimp or Maisano's sausage and peppers.

Key Largo sautees the shrimp in orange liqueur and serves it over a bed of spicy rice. It's not a regular menu item, but appears frequently as a special.

Maisano's, I was interested to learn, grinds its own sausage right on the premises.

"It's a lot of work," said owner Frank Maisano. Mmmmmmm, but worth it.

ers a line of vision into the trunk however Werth said fellow officer Charles Cole spotted a brick-shaped plastic bag in the driver's side rear corner of the car.

The plastic bag reportedly contained just over one pound of marijuana. Braun allegedly had purchased the marijuana earlier that evening from Jack Malaney, 34, the owner of a Garden City tanning salon and renter of a home at 48465 Seven Mile in Northville Township.

Braun and Bonner allegedly were following Malaney back to the Seven Mile home to purchase another half-pound of marijuana when the traffic stop occurred. Aided by information from Braun, police raided Malaney's home early Sept. 17, and confiscated more than 32 pounds of marijuana, a dozen guns, cash, jewelry, and electronic pagers and beepers.

Gurewitz, Bonner's attorney, attempted to paint his client as a person in the wrong place at the wrong time. He said Bonner had agreed to go bowling with Braun earlier Sept. 16, but left the bowling alley during the time Malaney allegedly was to deliver the pound of marijuana to Braun.

The meeting failed to materialize, however, and was rescheduled for 9:45 p.m. at Malaney's tanning salon, according to Werth's testimony. Bonner reportedly accompanied Braun because Braun was afraid to meet Malaney alone.

Bonner sat in the car during the tanning salon buy, partially because Malaney knew Bonner and understood he was the son of Taylor Police Chief Thomas Bonner.

Malaney reportedly sold the pound of marijuana to Braun in the tanning salon parking lot and the two allegedly agreed on another deal back at Malaney's home in Northville.

Police witnessed vehicles belonging to Malaney and Braun together on Seven Mile just east of Northville Road about 10:30 p.m. Sept. 16. A traffic infraction at the Seven Mile/Northville intersection ultimately led to the arrests.

Bonner was visibly upset after McCartney ordered him bound over for arraignment. Gurewitz hinted that the continuing case against Bonner was due to his father's position as Taylor police chief.

"There's no question Todd Bonner was in the wrong place at the wrong time," Gurewitz said. "I am amazed this case was ever brought (to court)."

first briefed the study commission on their proposal last Thursday.

Under their initial proposal, the plant would be renovated and 35,000 square feet leased to the city for a library and community center. The remaining space would be leased to two commercial tenants, reportedly an insurance company and medical facility.

The library and community center space would be leased for 25 years, at which time it would be donated to the city. Ford Field, the pond north of the plant and the Ford-owned land north of the pond would be turned over to the city immediately.

At Wednesday's meeting, study committee members discussed the possibility of the city purchasing the building itself through its Downtown Development Authority. Instead of building an expanded Cady Street parking deck, City Manager Gary Word told the committee that the city's financial advisor, Al Diebel of Comerica Bank, advised against the city proceeding with both projects during its 2½-year deficit reduction plan.

Presley posed the idea of a partnership between the city and Zervos, involving a joint redevelopment of the plant, to avoid paying Zervos to renovate the library space.

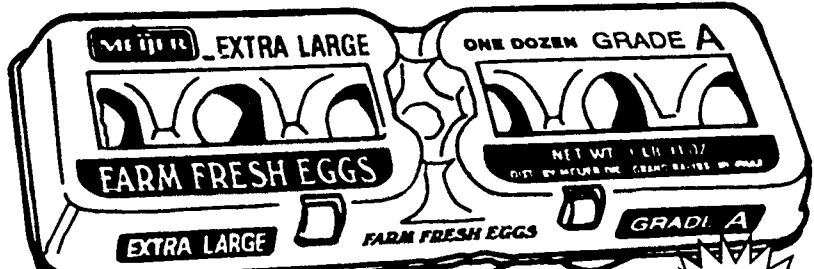
A district library concept remains an outside possibility too, provided that Ford does not sell the plant to another buyer before an election can be held. A district library study committee had set February as the earliest possible election date, though Orr said Wednesday that a January election may be possible.

Whatever the funding plan, city and township residents likely will have a say in the matter. "At some point, we're going to need an election on this thing," Johnson said.

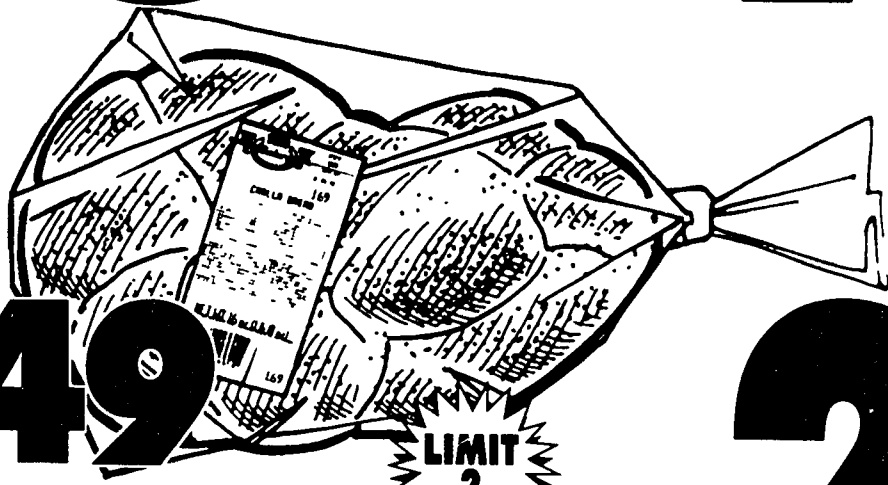

APPLE-APRICOT FINESSE

Pie filling

- 6 cups apples, peeled & chopped
- ¾ cups dried apricots, thinly sliced or snipped
- 2 Tablespoons raisins
- 1 teaspoon almond extract
- 1 cup rice syrup
- ¼ cup freshly squeezed orange juice
- 1 Tablespoon plus 1 teaspoon corn starch
- ¼ teaspoon ground cardamom
- ¼ teaspoon ground coriander

Topping

- ¼ cup almonds
- ¼ cup walnuts (chopped)
- ¼ cup cashew pieces
- ¼ cup sunflower seeds
- 2 Tablespoons sesame seeds
- ¼ teaspoon cinnamon
- 1 Tablespoon corn oil
- 2 Tablespoon maple syrup
- 2 Tablespoon barley malt

Combine the apricots, orange juice and almond extract. Let stand for 30 minutes. Stirring occasionally, add the apples, raisins, rice syrup and spices. Spoon mixture into an unbaked, whole wheat pie crust (bottom only).

To prepare topping, combine nuts, seeds and cinnamon. Add corn oil, syrup, and malt. Mix all together and place on top of the pie. Cover with foil to avoid burning.

Bake at 375 degrees for 30 minutes. Next, reduce heat to 350 degrees and bake for 30 minutes more. Finally, remove the foil and bake 15 minutes longer. Let cool on a rack.

- 6 lemons, cut in half, squeeze in marinade, add entire lemon

- 1 Tablespoon fresh ginger, chopped
- 2 cups soy sauce
- ¼ teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- 2 cups brown sugar
- 2 bay leaves

- 10 boneless, skinless chicken breasts
- 2 Tablespoons salt
- 1 Tablespoon black pepper

Cagers fall to Walled Lake 51-31 on road

Walled Lake Western survived a strong third-quarter run by the Mustang basketball team Thursday night and took a 51-31 decision at home.

Trailing 38-13, Northville went on a 13-0 run midway through the period. Krista Howe and Lindsay Bacon led the charge with six and five points respectively. But the Warriors, behind Erin Vicary's 19 points, withstood the assault and won convincingly.

"That 13-0 run had me a little scared," Walled Lake coach Don Peterson said. "I was surprised. I thought we had them buried."

Gretchen Sander converted on one of two free throws to put Northville on the scoreboard first. Western countered with five straight points before Julia Bermingham made it 5-4 on a three-point play.

The game was tied at seven when Walled Lake pulled away for good. Vicary nailed a long three-point shot, and the Warriors went on to post a 15-9 lead at the end of the quarter.

Walled Lake dominated the second period.

Vicary outscored Northville in the quarter 6-4. Unfortunately, the sophomore's teammates added seven more points and led Northville 28-13 at the half.

It appeared as if Walled Lake would blow the Mustangs right off the court in the third.

A pair of fast-break baskets by the Warriors made it 32-13. The home

team then rattled off six more points before Northville got on track.

With Howe, Bacon, Jennifer Hayden, Marci Bolger and Kate Woodrich in the game, the Mustangs came to life.

Howe drove to the hoop, to the left of the key, and scored her team's first basket of the third at the 3:20 mark. Seconds later she scored on almost an identical play.

Two free throws by Bacon and another Howe basket continued the comeback. Bacon then hit on a fast break shot and a free throw to cut the Walled Lake lead to 38-26.

That was as close as Northville could come. Walled Lake scored a point to break the run, with just 15 seconds left, and the quarter ended 39-26.

Walled Lake went on a 10-0 run to start the fourth quarter and then coasted in for the victory.

"I thought our kids shot well and played great defense," Peterson said. "But (Northville) didn't give up. It's a credit to their coaching and to their kids."

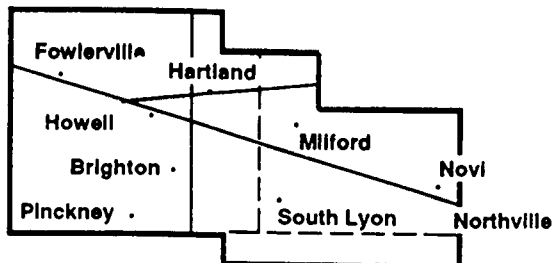

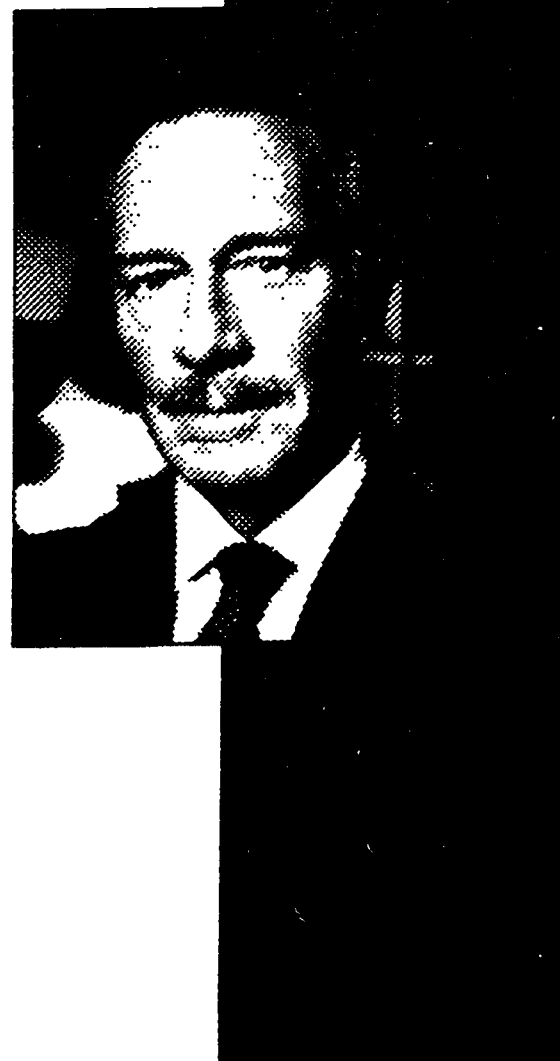

For Pueblo people, courage is key to 'Surviving Columbus'

Stories told with pride, not anger

Taos. Zuni. Acoma. Pecos. Hopi. Isleta. Laguna. More than a dozen settlements of the Pueblo Indian people adorn the desert Southwest like turquoise stones on a silver necklace. Other settlements, long abandoned — Chaco Canyon, Canyon de Chelly — are North America's Pyramids and Taj Mahal.

The land is so large (a view of 40 miles is common) and fierce, the people, animals and trees so small, who would think to own or conquer it? Not the Pueblo people. In the first millennium after Christ, their respect for the land gave rise to a religion full of ceremony, pageantry and storytelling. They did not share in the perverse practices of the tribes of Central and South America, but passed a heritage of decency and friendship from generation to generation. They farmed and hunted, practiced

weaving, pottery and jewelry-making, developed music and dance. Their history was all around them and even in their hands: A favorite symbol of one artist might be copied by her descendants for generations. So it continued for hundreds of years.

Meanwhile, in another culture, cities were densely populated, and the demand for products and resources was great. Competition was catalyst. Propelled by this feverish energy, Christopher Columbus set sail on a cleverly devised expedition of trade. He missed his intended destination, but any disappointment was soon vanquished by the belief that he had done better than to find a trading partner. Here was a land whose bounty was his — and his sovereign's for the taking.

Within 50 years, Columbus' successors had cut through Central America to the Pacific, turned northward and marched as far as Pueblo territory. In 1539, Zuni beheld Moroccan in the first encounter of an outsider with the Pueblo people.

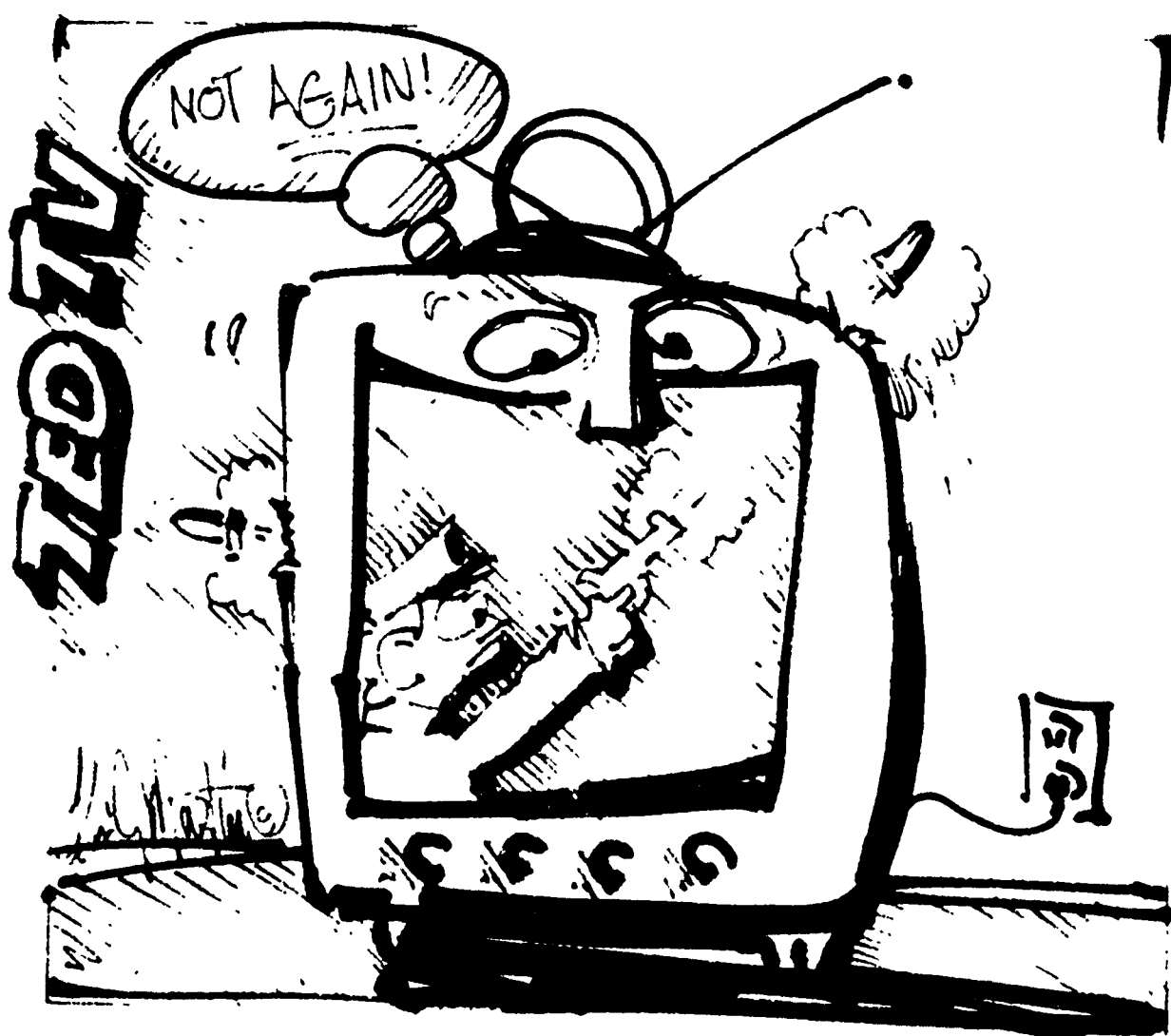
Surviving Columbus: The Story of the Pueblo People, a two-hour special airing Monday, Oct. 12, on PBS, recounts the Pueblos' 450-year history of interaction with wave upon wave of treasure-seekers, conquerors and settlers. Produced with assistance from the Institute of American Indian Arts in Santa Fe, N.M., the special draws on the expertise of writers, researchers and crew members, many of whom represent Pueblo tribes, including host Conroy Chino, an Acoma Indian who works as an investigative reporter in Los Angeles. The producers artfully weave together interviews, re-enactments and archival film and photographs to tell the Pueblo story, and the viewer often forgets that the face on the screen is not that of the long-dead ancestor whose story is being told.

In their heyday, the Pueblos numbered 50,000, but disease and warfare with the Spanish conquistadors and the European-style governments that followed them reduced those numbers to as few as 7,000 before any action was taken to protect their territorial and civil rights.

At times, the two-hour special seems long, but, as the Indian storytellers say, if you are going to tell a story, tell it from the beginning. *Surviving Columbus* is the first film to tell the complete story of the development and population of the Pueblo region from the point of view of its most ancient observers.

The essence of the story lies in the conflicting visions of the actors: in a stark landscape, the Pueblos saw what was there, while the conquistadors, on their missions to find cities of gold, saw only what was not, and the missionaries overlooked the tribes' moral code in their zeal to introduce one of their own.

In recent decades, well-meaning outsiders have begun to appreciate and collect Pueblo art and artifacts, but even those acquainted with the land will discover how remote their lives have been from the people who live there.

Now, you say the scout (Robert Mitchum) also played the detective in *Cape Fear*, and you are right — if you mean the police detective in the 1991 version (Joe Don Baker played the private detective hired as a bodyguard, the role Martin Balsam had in the 1962 original). Gregory Peck played attorney Bowden in the original and appeared briefly as the lawyer representing Max Cady (Robert De Niro) before judge Martin Balsam in the remake.

PBS wants to help turn out the vote on election day

Voting booth a lonely place for the uninformed

With the busy lives most Americans lead, "there's almost no time to thoughtfully grasp what you need to know to make an informed judgment about the events of your time," says Sandy Heberer, PBS' director of news and information programming.

And though voters will have to enter the election-day booth alone, they can at least have the benefit of a few hours of informative programming from Public Broadcasting, whose mandate to serve the people is never clearer than in an election year.

"In a way this is a watershed year," notes Heberer, "because there certainly is going to be a large turnover in Congress."

Heberer is responsible for coordinating PBS election efforts, no small task considering each program is produced by an individual station.

"What we do," says Heberer, "is work with the producers who have regular presences in the schedule, like *Frontline*, *Washington Week in Review*, and of course *The MacNeil/Lehrer NewsHour*, and see what their election plans are. Then we work with other series to develop as comprehensive an election approach as possible."

The result is 20 specials and a handful of regular series covering topics from Bill Clinton's leadership style (*Frontline's The Choice: '92*, airing Wednesday, Oct. 21) to an examination of alternative national health care programs (*Health in America: In Search of a Cure*, on Monday, Oct. 26).

In recent weeks, questions of race and politics have been discussed in *Voices of the Electorate*, a pair of specials anchored by Barbara Jordan and Edward James Olmos, and the Phil Donahue-moderated forum *The Issue Is Race*.

September's *Why Bother Voting?* was an attempt to convince young adults to register, while *Word! Teens Speak Out!*, which is as yet without an air date, will

allow minority teens to debate the issues with candidates and party leaders.

Other specials, including *Move Over: Women and the '92 Campaign*, set to air Friday, Oct. 16, point to a wider circle of programs that could uncover the hidden-agenda issues of the '92 campaign. One of these is *Anita Hill and Clarence Thomas: Public Hearing, Private Pain*, airing Tuesday, Oct. 13, on *Frontline*.

For those seeking political insight in lighter doses, Friday, Oct. 23, brings *Democracy in Action*, a look "at the U.S. election process through the eyes of two Russian journalists," says Heberer. "I think it'll be funny, it'll be moving and it'll offer some interesting perspectives."

More staple fare includes *Listening to America With Bill Moyers*, a weekly series that debuted in April and runs through the election. While the program began as an issues forum, its focus has now shifted to analysis of the events of the campaign.

Should the presidential candidates ever agree to the terms of a televised debate, Robert MacNeil and Jim Lehrer will anchor PBS' coverage and analysis. Their *NewsHour* will also provide election-night reports in prime time.

Yet if there is a single must-see program on the PBS schedule, it is probably *The Choice: '92*, a dual biography of George Bush and Bill Clinton produced by *Frontline*, the American masters of long-form investigative journalism.

"They'll be looking at the character and training of each of the candidates," says Heberer, "and what kind of president each would likely make."

They'll do it, she says, "by really digging into (the candidates') souls."

After that, the soul-searching will be strictly up to the electorate. • TV Listing Inc.

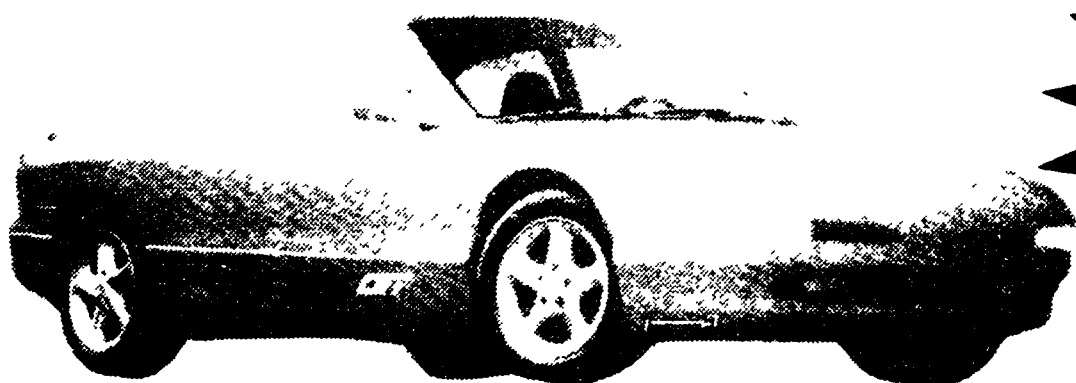
