

## Hiring plan battle looms

Northville Township officials plan to forge ahead and hire a new department head in the near future, despite the protests of incoming board members.

After sitting on a vacancy atop its Water and Sewer Department for 16 months, lame-duck Township Board members appear poised to select a replacement for late department Superintendent Walter Holmby.

The township received 13 resumes for the superintendent slot by an Oct. 2 deadline, township Manager Richard Henningsen said Tuesday. Henningsen said he was seeking information from Water and Sewer Commission officials before deciding on his next step.

Filling the slot would be one of the current board's last major moves, and the plan has drawn criticism from incoming Supervisor Karen Baja and Clerk Sue Hillebrand.

Baja and Hillebrand say the position should be filled by the new board. They say the outgoing board promised to avoid last-minute decisions that could affect their successors.

Henningsen is heading up the hunt for a new Water and Sewer superintendent. He apparently was ready to go along with the wishes of the new board, but township sources said Supervisor Betty Lennox ordered him to proceed with the search during a staff meeting Monday.

Henningsen at first attempted to deflect questions about Lennox's or

## Developers again eye county land

Huntington Falls is back on the front burner.

There's no signed paperwork yet, but a deal for 930 acres of Wayne County property in Northville Township apparently is alive and kicking.

"We have been negotiating with the county," said Robert DeMattia, president of R.A. DeMattia Company, a partner in the Huntington Falls Limited Partnership that also includes downriver industrialist Heinz Prechter and developer Michael Horowitz.

DeMattia would not discuss project details, although he said the development plan was "basically the same" as had been pitched and accepted by Wayne County back in the fall of 1990.

"Put it this way: We're back in there talking to them," DeMattia said. "We never were not talking, but (the public) just didn't know about

it."

Like DeMattia, a Wayne County representative was tight-lipped about a possible deal for the sprawling, tree-rimmed site. But Arthur Wild, of the county Department of Jobs and Economic Development, did say the county is "looking at a couple options," though he would not say what those options are.

"I can't yet, but may be able to provide information in the near future," Wild said. "We need to make a couple of decisions, and see which way the county wants to go."

Wild said the county's time frame to explore those projects stands at "a couple of weeks, not a couple of months."

DeMattia, who has ridden through peaks and valleys with the proposed project, would not involve himself in a when's-it-going-to-happen game.

"I wish I could, but I can't," he said. "I can't give any type ... of time

## Stage set for big songfest Sunday

World-famous singer William Warfield will appear in Northville this weekend.

The First Presbyterian Church of Northville will present the renowned bass-baritone in a special concert of "Old American Songs and Spirituals." The concert will include selected sea shanties, several familiar spirituals, and Aaron Copland's "Old American Songs," which Warfield has recorded with the Columbia Orchestra and Copland conducting.

Warfield is best known for his performance in the MGM musical *Show Boat*, where he sang "Old Man River." He also won great fame for his rendition of the lead role in Gershwin's *Porgy and Bess* opposite Leontyne Price.

Dr. Warfield is engaged as a full-time performer, making appearances steadily around the country. This season, along with solo recitals, he is scheduled to perform with several symphony orchestras including a concert with the Philadelphia Orchestra.

His autobiography, *William Warfield: My Music and My Life*, was published last October, and an album is forthcoming.

Warfield has recently retired from teaching and chairing the Voice Department of the University of Illinois. He has been awarded honorary doctorates from Boston University, the University of Arkansas, Lafayette University, Augustana College, and James Milliken University. He also was the winner of a Grammy award in the "spoken word" category for his narration of Aaron Copland's "A Lincoln Portrait" accompanied by the Eastman Philharmonic Orchestra.

The concert will be Sunday, Oct. 11, at 7 p.m. at the First Presbyterian Church of Northville, 200 E. Main St. Tickets are \$10 and seating is limited.

to 250. Ticket reservations may be made by calling 349-0911 during business hours.

The program will begin with five sea shanties, "Rio Grande," "Blow Ye Winds," "Across the Western Ocean," "Mobile Bay," and "Oh Shenandoah." Next come two chain gang songs, "Ev'ry Mail Day" and "Water Boy." Anglo-American songs "Waly, Waly" and "Buffalo Boy" conclude the first part of the program.

After the intermission, Warfield will sing old American songs "Little Horses," "Zion's Walls," "I Bought Me a Cat," "At the River," and "Ching-a-ring Chaw." The evening ends with five spirituals, "Heaven is One Beautiful Place," "Let's Have a Union," "Take My Mother Home," "I Got to Lie Down," and "My Good Lord Done Been Here."

Pianist David Phillips will accompany Warfield. The concert was arranged by Scott VanOrnum, new director of music at First Presbyterian Church.

## Cash-short city borrows bucks

To cope with the city's continuing cash crunch, the council Monday agreed to borrow \$1.4 million in short-term tax- and revenue-anticipation notes.

The notes will be repaid next year by property tax payments and other revenue.

The move is similar to last year's

borrowing of \$1.03 million, as part of the city's 2½-year deficit elimination plan. That plan was enacted after the state withheld \$735,000 in anticipated racetrack revenues, and deficits were discovered in the city's general and capital project funds.

Last year, the city sold \$800,000 in one-year tax-anticipation notes and \$230,000 in revenue-anticipation notes — its maximum allowable amount — to cover general

fund debts for the year. An additional \$320,000 was transferred from other city funds into the general fund.

On Monday, the City Council authorized City Manager Gary Word again to seek the maximum allowable — now \$1,170,000 in tax-anticipation notes and \$230,000 in revenue-anticipation notes. Word said he expected that the city will not need to transfer money from other funds this year.

Word attributed the need for more short-term borrowing to the ongoing cash needs in connection with progress on the parking deck as well as the current deficit situation relative to the General Fund.

Council members were puzzled that the city would seek to borrow more this year than last. "Why would it be greater this year if our deficit is

## WTUA scraps bid plan, tries again

Disappointed by a lack of response to a professional services plea, WTUA officials have moved to rebid a portion of their controversial project.

The Western Townships Utilities Authority will again seek requests for qualifications (RFQs) for an operations and maintenance contract that could be worth about \$750,000 annually to a successful bidder.

Officials connected to the Northville, Plymouth, and Canton town-

ships' sewer authority clearly were taken aback when just two firms tendered complete bids to operate and maintain pumping stations and lines for the \$100 million sewer project.

As expected, those bidding on the project included a subsidiary company of Ayres, Lewis, Norris & May, the Ann Arbor-based firm that has earned the lion's share of WTUA's no-bid required \$10 million engineering contract.

The second bidder was SDM Inc., a firm which counts as a partner Patrick Downes, father of former Wayne

County Commission candidate Patrick Downes.

The Ypsilanti Communities Utilities Authority (YCUA) forwarded a partial bid, said WTUA Chairperson Thomas Yack, who said he was "shocked and disappointed" at the light bid turnout.

On Monday, Yack said WTUA decided to reopen the bidding process, in hopes of attracting "three to four times as many" operations and maintenance bidders.

WTUA did not open the first round of bids after the unsatisfactory turn-

out, Yack said.

And any decision on bid awards will be up to the new WTUA commission, Yack said. The final call will be taken away from outgoing WTUA politicians such as Northville Township Supervisor Betty Lennox and Plymouth Township's Gerald Law, and left to Yack and newcomers Karen Baja of Northville Township and either Ronald Edwards or Kathleen Keen-McCarthy of Plymouth Township.

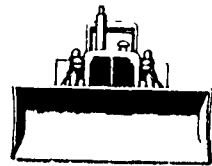

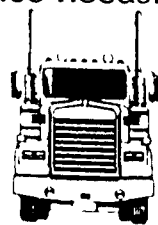

# Trumpeter blows into two bands

As if being selected to play with the famous Gold Jazz Band wasn't enough, Northville's Jeff Schodowski was delighted to learn two weeks ago that he'd be part of a prestigious international touring jazz band.

"I was ecstatic," the 16-year-old trumpet player said about the invitation to tour Europe with the Blue Lake Fine Arts Camp's jazz band. "I thought my audition was really bad. But then I got home and saw the letter from Blue Lakes on the table. I opened it up and the first word I read was 'Congratulations,' and I knew then."

What contributed to his selection to the international jazz band was his participation in the camp's 20-member Gold Jazz Band. He was chosen to be a part of that ensemble after attending the fine arts camp in August. That band, he said, is considered the "creme de la creme" of the camp and plays only during the students' brief stint at the camp.

But if that wasn't enough, Schodowski was thrilled to learn he'd been selected to play on the camp's international jazz band. He is one of 15 students from a pool of 150 who auditioned to land a spot in the camp's International Jazz Band.

# Family faces continued harassment after move

A Farmington Hills family moving to Northville is reportedly being harassed by a Northville clan.

The trouble apparently stems from a previous harassment conviction against a 20-year-old Northville man. After the conviction, the man and his relatives were ordered not to harass the Farmington Hills family. But since the family has begun moving into a house under construction on Elmsmere, the harassment reportedly has continued.

On Sept. 29, workmen at the Elmsmere home reported that a woman matching the description of the convicted man's mother wandered through the Elmsmere house with an angry expression on her face, and acting suspiciously. The next day, the convicted man himself was seen parked in front of the home with another man. He was told to leave and drove off with-

out comment.

**DISORDERLY CONDUCT:** A woman told police she was attacked by a man at Arbor Drugs Sept. 29 after backing out of a parking space. The woman said her car was nearly hit by another driver while backing out about 5:10 p.m. When she drove by the man and scolded him for almost causing an accident, he reportedly began swearing at her and leaned into her car window to spit on her.

City police were attempting to contact the 39-year-old Coldwater man as of press time, to hear his side of the story.

**INDECENT EXPOSURE:** A Northville woman reported that she witnessed a man masturbating in the furniture section at Meijer, 20401 Haggerty, early Oct. 3.

The woman described the white male as about 25 years old, 6 feet

tall and 220 pounds. She said the man was wearing a black "Ford" jacket, black pants, and wire rimmed glasses.

Police searched the area but could not locate the suspect.

# Drive-in holdup at McDonald's

A McDonald's employee last week told township police he was robbed at gunpoint as he stood at the 39700 Five Mile restaurant's drive-through window.

The victim, a 17-year-old Livonia man, told police a white male in his 20s stuck a large blue steel revolver through the store's drive-through window last Saturday at about 8:45 p.m.

The man was on foot at the time and reportedly demanded cash from the employee, who told police he handed over in excess of \$400.

The robber then reportedly fled to the area of the Northville Car Wash northwest of McDonald's, police said.

Police have obtained a composite drawing of the gunman, but do not have a specific suspect in mind, said township police Det. Michael Wildt.

"We made a composite drawing of the person he claims did it," Wildt

said, adding that police were planning follow-up interviews of some McDonald's employees Tuesday.

According to police reports, the victim was standing at the drive-through window counting out money from the store's cash drawer when he heard a noise outside the window.

He reportedly turned and saw a man standing at the window, pointing a gun through the window opening. The man reportedly told the victim: "Give me your money; I want your big bills."

The gunman was described as 6 feet tall with a thin build and straight, collar-length dark hair and a rough, two- to three-day beard. He reportedly was wearing camouflage pants, a black T-shirt, and black gloves at the time of the incident.

A Michigan State Police canine unit from Flat Rock was called to the scene and reportedly followed a rambling track along Haggerty, I-275, M-14, and back north on Haggerty before the trail was lost.

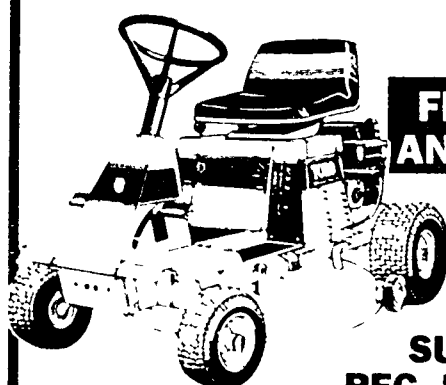

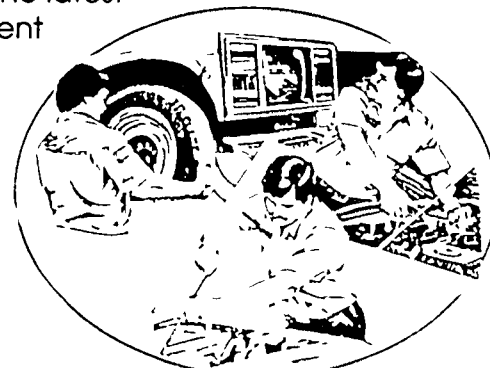

# City council eyes report on township's future

City officials got a close look at the "visionary" Northville 2000 Strategic Planning Committee report Monday, and they were impressed by what they saw.

The 53-page report represents several months of discussion by a 22-member township committee assembled by Township Supervisor Betty Lennox on behalf of the township's Board of Trustees. But several of its recommendations, as made evident during Monday's presentation, apply to the Northville community as a whole.

"It says the year 2000, but that's only eight years away so we're really looking at the year 2000 and beyond," said Committee Member Barbara Moroski-Browne.

Moroski-Browne also made clear that the initial report only represents the committee's preliminary findings. She described this first phase as a "visionary" one, "where we just set our cards out on the table and figure out what we need, without worrying about the cost."

Phase two will involve ranking initial recommendations by priority, figuring out how much their implementation will cost, and what the township can afford, she said.

While the committee focused its attention on Northville Township, the city's name comes up throughout the report. The suggested strategy for saving costs and improving performance within the township Fire Department is the "possible consolidation of certain facilities, functions or personnel, beginning first with the Township and the City of Northville with the Township being the driving force." Joint dispatching is seen as the first step toward that end.

The recommendation meshes with longstanding discussions about a combined police dispatching center, and follows the recent approval of a city/township task force to study police consolidation.

In the area of human services, the committee recommended establishment of a Northville Community Center to house a range of service organizations and community

activities. "Serious consideration should be given to the vacant Ford Plant," the report recommended. "Although it is located in the City rather than the Township, the tradition and visibility of this location gives it the best chance for broad-based community support for a special millage to support the additional expenditures."

Said Moroski-Browne, who chaired Northville 2000's human services committee, "Our thought was it was more efficient to have everything in one spot."

The city is now in the midst of negotiations with a potential purchaser of the Ford Plant over the developer's plan to lease space for a new library and other community functions, including several of the functions mentioned in the Northville 2000 report.

And though the report does not pose the Ford Plant as a library location specifically, it notes that the city and township "have outgrown the current library space."

The committee's aim to encourage more commercial development within the township sparked a question from Mayor Pro Tem Carolann Ayers, who asked whether

the Northville 2000 report would work against the longstanding recognition of downtown Northville as a retail center for both the city and township. She was assured it would not.

"We really have a shared downtown area, and we don't want to destroy it," said Finance Committee Chair Don Mueller Jr. "When I'm talking commercial, we were thinking of light industrial."

Council Member Jerry Mittman asked whether the committee ever discussed the possibility of a merger between the entire city and township, and was told by Mueller that such discussion was "limited."

Council members urged more talk along that theme. "We haven't talked about a merger for a long time," noted Mayor Chris Johnson, "but we recognize the financial situation that we're all in, and maybe a combination of all our resources, including the dreaded 'M' word, should be discussed."

"It would be an interesting discussion," Moroski-Browne agreed.

## Hundreds walk to help the hungry

Hungry people in Northville, Novi, Detroit and the world are a little better off today because of 375 pairs of feet.

The feet belong to the participants in last weekend's annual 6.2 mile Northville-Nowi CROP walk. They, and the people who backed them up with pledges, earned close to \$13,000 last Sunday.

Quite a success, considering that the original goal for this year's walk was 200 participants and \$10,000 in pledges, said Rev. Chuck Jacobs of First United Methodist Church of Northville.

Jacobs explained that, of the money the walkers earned, 10 percent will go to Northville Civic Center; 10 percent will go to the Novi Emergency Food Fund; 5 percent will go to Detroit's Focus: Hope program; and the remaining 75 percent will go to the Church World Service to help alleviate hunger around the world.

The walk, which began in Novi and ended in Northville, was coordinated by members of Novi United Methodist Church, Church of the Holy Family, Our Lady of Victory, Northville First Presbyterian Church and Northville

United Methodist Church. Other churches were represented as well during the walk.

Each walker collected sponsors and monetary pledges before the walk.

Sunday's walk began at the Novi Civic Center and traveled south on Taft, then wound its way through subdivisions until it came out on Center Street in Northville, near Amerman School. It continued through downtown Northville and ended at Northville First Presbyterian Church.

Rest stops were set up along the route and transportation was available for anyone who couldn't make it all the way to the end. The highest goal for participants was to raise the money, rather than push themselves to complete the distance. Still, the majority of walkers made it to the end.

Coordinators of the event, Dave Black of the First United Methodist Church in Northville and Chuck Jacobs of the Novi United Methodist Church, both commented that the event was a huge success.

Black said that plans are already in progress for a walk in the fall of 1993 with a goal of 500 walkers and \$20,000 to be raised for hunger.

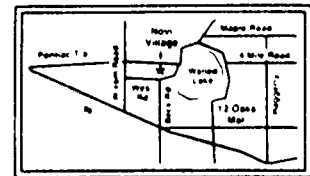

# Rising enrollment adds to large classes, tight budget

It's a hard way to run a business when you're taking in students, laying off teachers and operating on a reduced budget.

Lost tax-hike requests and recaptured state aid aren't the only culprits to blame for larger class sizes in Northville. Enrollment is up 123 students this year, according to unofficial fourth Friday counts released by school officials Tuesday.

According to the figures, which have yet to be verified by school officials, 1992-93 district-wide enrollment is up 3.3 percent over last year's tally. Enrollments were up at all three levels, with the elementaries taking the biggest leap of 80 new students.

Amerman Elementary was the only school in the district that reported a loss, three students. Moraine claimed the biggest jump with 43 new students. The two middle schools reported 32 new students, with the bulk of those attending classes at Meads Mill. That left the high school with the smallest increase district-wide, with only four new students.

Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski was hesitant before commenting on the unofficial tallies and the impact they would have on the district.

"I really have no comment on it at

all because they are unofficial and we've only taken a preliminary look at them," he said.

He did say the information wasn't surprising given that the number of new students had fallen within the range the district had projected for the 1992-93 school year.

Assistant Superintendent for Instructional Services Dolly McMaster echoed Rezmierski's thoughts and cautioned against using the figures as a benchmark before they are verified.

"They are unofficial and we have

two weeks to confirm them with the county and shake down any inconsistencies," she said.

McMaster said it's important to stress that the figures were unofficial because the individual school tallies don't add up to the aggregate totals.

Rezmierski said the administration would be reviewing and verifying the counts over the next two weeks. After a closer look he expected to have a better idea of total enrollment figures district-wide and for individual schools.

# Schools will wait and see about court ruling

Northville school officials aren't claiming victory in the fight for state aid, despite the recent ruling of the Michigan Supreme Court that says schools are entitled to the money that's been recaptured.

The high court upheld the Headlee Amendment and ruled in favor of Northville and the 50 other districts that enjoined in the suit last September. The lawsuit seeks to put a halt to the state's recapturing actions and restore state paid Social Security. Both issues have had a grave impact on school district budgets: Projections from last year indicate that recapturing alone squeezed more than \$72 million out of more than 50 districts in 1990.

The high court ruled 4-3 on Sept. 29 that the state was wrong to take away ("recapture") funds for categorical special education, transportation for special education

students, bilingual instruction, and the lunch and supplemental milk program. The ruling also means the state doesn't have to pay school districts' Social Security taxes despite a 1956 agreement. "Social Security coverage is not a state-required activity or service within the meaning of the Headlee amendment," said the high court majority.

But Northville Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski isn't taking too much stock in the ruling for two reasons. First and foremost is the state's track record in unfulfilled promises and that the case still needs to be heard by the Court of Appeals. He and his fellow plaintiffs named in the suit aren't running to the bank just yet.

"We are still waiting to hear the verdict of the Court of Appeals," he said.

Essentially, Rezmierski said, what the court's ruling is saying is that under the Headlee Amendment from 1978, services mandated by the state must be paid for by the state. If that's true, districts across the state could see a

windfall in retroactive state aid. But that isn't likely given the current status of the state's budget.

"All they are doing is rearranging the figures," Rezmierski said. "They've moved FICA and retirement money into non-categorical aid columns, which means they could recapture that now, too."

"There really is no analysis available to us to find out how this will impact us. It will take some time to figure the impact. But retroactive pay is very unlikely."

The case was filed by Gerald Schmidt, a Warren Woods School District taxpayer and trustee. It was joined by Northville and more than 50 other plaintiffs, mostly from the metropolitan suburbs and the Lake Michigan shoreline.

The complex decision revolves around two sections of the 1978 Headlee amendment to the Michigan Constitution.

Sec. 29 prohibits the state "from reducing the state financed proportion of the necessary costs of any existing

activity or service required of units of local government . . . A new activity or service . . . shall not be required by the legislature . . . unless a state appropriation is made and disbursed to pay the unit of local government."

Sec. 30 requires the state to pay 41.6 percent of its budget to local units, the same proportion in effect in 1978.

Both then-Gov. James Blanchard, a Democrat, and his successor, Republican John Engler, supported "recapture." They and key lawmakers of both parties saw it as a method of closing the gap between rich (those spending up to \$9,000 per student) and poor (spending as little as \$2,500) school districts.

Chief Justice Cavanagh, in a lone dissent, upheld the state's position. Cavanagh said state aid should be calculated as a percentage of aid to all local school districts in the aggregate. "As long as the state is prevented from shifting its funding responsibilities onto local governments on an overall, statewide basis," Sec. 29 is satisfied, said one of the court's most liberal members.

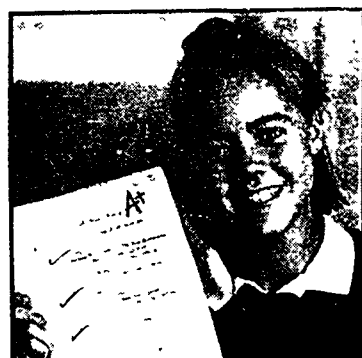

# Students offered European jaunt

Now more than ever, a trip to Western Europe could prove to be the best way to integrate history into the high school curriculum.

Northville High School teacher George Aune and former teacher Chris Ford are hoping students and adults from Northville seize the timely opportunity to explore Russia, Poland and Western Europe with them this summer.

The 15-day trip is the second one of its kind organized and executed by Aune and Ford. Along the way students will tour Russia, Moscow, Warsaw, Poznan, Berlin, Paris and London.

"There's a lot of history in all the countries we are going to," said Ford, who used to be a full time teacher at the high school before he was laid off this year. "With all the changes going on in what used to be the Soviet Union, it's a great opportunity for the kids to see what it's like over there now."

Ford and Aune are planning the trip with the help of the EF Institute

for Cultural Exchange for June 22-July 6. They are hoping for 20 takers on their offer, which costs students \$2,250. All travel arrangements are being handled by EF, a national known organization that plans trips like this one that are geared towards students.

EF handles airfares and hotel accommodations that are all based on student rates. In addition, EF handles the itinerary and sees to it that stops along the trip are geared toward students' interest and "towards enhancing the learning and educational experience," Ford said.

"EF does all its own bookkeeping;

we are just the official counselors," Aune said. "In each country they provide a separate guide but they also assign a multi-lingual guide to accompany the group throughout the whole trip."

"Chris and I have done a lot of traveling, and we think it's an exception tool for learning," Aune said.

Students will travel and visit prominent landmarks like Red Square, the Kremlin, the Eiffel Tower, Big Ben, and Buckingham Palace to see the changing of the guard.

In contrast to other tours, this one provides students with a comparison of life in east and west Europe as they

travel from as far east as Paris and London to as far west as Moscow and Warsaw.

"They can see how buses and trains and cars run in Europe and experience the black market," Aune said.

On a past trip, Aune said students actually got to barter with brokers from the black market. In exchange for their clothes and personal items, students returned home with Russian sailor hats, jackets, and flags and one of a kind souvenirs that are rich in historical value.

"It's not only an incredible experience, but it's fun dealing with the black market," Aune said.

"People in the black market are high school and college aged people who have a thirst for western goods," Ford said.

"Those are some of the fun things that go on," said Aune said.

Students interested in going abroad this summer can look at the showcase detailing the trip outside the school office or talk with either teacher. Slots are also open to adults in the community. If interested call the high school and ask for either Ford or Aune.

# Township argues over plan to hire sewer head

der, saying, "You can't believe everything you hear second hand" but when pushed admitted the order had been delivered.

"The supervisor gave me that direction yesterday," he said.

Henningsen said he has wanted to fill the position for some time, but when asked if there was any pressing need to cap the spot before Nov. 20 — when the new board takes over — he

said: "Heck no. But I've been told to get on with it."

Lennox could not be reached for comment. Henningsen said he did not know why Lennox wanted to push the search process.

Henningsen also said the heat was turned up on the township last month, when the *Record* printed a story on the Water and Sewer superintendent search.

"You made it touchy; you published it in the paper the first time,"

he said. "When you published that all hell broke loose from the seven people that are going to take office."

"I get directed to do one thing and then another," Henningsen added. "Before I go any farther I want to talk to Austin Marshall (chairperson of the Water and Sewer Commission)."

Township advertisements for the position, which includes a salary range of \$32,000-\$42,000, were limited to *The Detroit News* and the *Michigan Chronicle*.

Henningsen said he felt it is important for the township to hire someone for the superintendent's job. He said Bill Anderson, an Ayres, Lewis, Norris & May employee contracting with the township on a part-time basis, is filling in capably, but "can only do certain things" and the department needs full-time leadership.

But Henningsen said the Water and Sewer department currently was undertaking no activities that could put the township in dire straits if no

one was hired immediately.

Baja, the supervisor-elect, said she stands by her request that the new board make the superintendent hire. She said the board has acted inconsistently on its earlier pledge to limit decisions that would impact the new group.

"From what I understand, they're not going to act (at tonight's board meeting) on the ethics policy, and not going to act on the (Beck Road) park," Baja said. "Why should the Water

and Sewer superintendent be different?"

"My preference is that they wait for the new board," she said.

The current board's opportunities to appoint a new Water and Sewer superintendent appear to be limited. Barring some kind of quick hire tonight, the board could take action at a budget adoption meeting set for Oct. 28, or at its final scheduled regular session on Nov. 12. New board members take office Nov. 20.

One possible alteration to the original plan could include a county-maintained 18-hole golf course. DeMattia originally was set to finance and build a public course, but county officials since have looked closely at operating a course there.

One scenario could have the county contracting with DeMattia to build the golf course. Of the golf course question, DeMattia would only say that financing methods would "be different" than under original terms.

In the past, Wild has said the county was interested in developing and operating a golf course on the

site.

Huntington Falls was heralded as the cure for the long-ailing county land property, which is divided by Sheldon Road and falls between Five and Six Mile roads with a Beck Road western border.

Home of the former Wayne County Child Development Center, the property has over the years fallen victim to

disregard, disrepair and disappointment.

Abandoned buildings dominate the site, and have become a haven for vandals, firebugs, and weapons-laden war game players.

DeMattia, a local developer with a score of successful business ventures under his belt, was to be the point man in a \$31.75-million site


overhaul. His far-reaching project was to include roughly equal portions of light industrial, recreational, and residential development.

Initial estimates set eventual net worth of the planned 10-year project at about \$1 billion. Of particular interest to school and township officials was the proposed strip of tax-revenue-producing light industrial

businesses along the west Five Mile and Beck Road corridor.

Difficulty in arranging financing stalled, and seemed to doom the project earlier this year, when DeMattia could not meet a county deadline for paying off the sale price. County officials said at that time they would entertain other offers for the site, including splitting it up into smaller parcels.

being reduced?" asked Council Member Paul Folino.

"We must maintain cash flow in the city for the coming year," Word explained. "Although we are making progress in reducing the deficit in the general fund, cash flow is a different problem."

Council Member Jerry Mittman

asked why the city could not continue transferring money from other funds into the general fund, to avoid paying interest on a bank loan.

"It could just create other problems within those funds internally," replied Chief Financial Officer Mark Christiansen, adding that the general fund would still have to pay interest to the funds from which it borrowed.

Auditor Jim Eagan from Plante & Moran elaborated on the explanation, saying the city should borrow as much as it can, "and then you want to use your inter-fund borrowing as a fall-back position. What you want to do is protect your fall-back positions."

Eagan added that the time lag involved in borrowing money through tax and revenue anticipation notes

could spell disaster in a sudden fiscal crisis.

Mittman was also reluctant to approve the request without seeing the numbers supporting it. "We say it but we don't show it anywhere," he said. Mayor Chris Johnson asked whether the council could postpone a vote on the matter until its Oct. 19 meeting, when council members could review documents showing the need for the

borrowing.

While Word said that the vote could be postponed, he added, "I've been advised we should proceed with a reasonable amount of haste."

Council members finally agreed to continue seeking the loans, authorizing Word to notify the Michigan Department of Treasury of the city's intent. The treasury department must approve before the city borrows the

money.

Council members will review the loans in greater detail at their Oct. 19 meeting, along with the city's annual audit report from Plante & Moran.

Next year, according to a projection by Chief Accountant/Systems Manager Beverly Walters, the city should be able to cover its general fund debt by selling \$700,000 in tax anticipation notes.

The first round of bids left Yack scratching his head for answers.

"I don't know what the problem was," he said. "I don't know that we won't end up in the same place I'm at a loss for an explanation."

Some critics have claimed WTUA's bid specification document was heavily weighted in favor of the Ayres, Lewis, Norris & May firm.

The bid price covered only 10 percent of the proposed evaluation criteria, while items such as familiar-

ity with community and with the project garnered much higher status.

Yack said WTUA wants to remove such doubts and foster higher bid turnout this time around. He said WTUA Executive Director Deloris Newell and a committee of represen-

tatives from the three communities — including Northville Township Manager Richard Henningsen — will

review the bid specifications and look for holes in the document.

Newell also will be directed to con-

tact firms that had knowledge of the bid process to learn why they were not interested.

In this column mention is often made of early Northville. This week a little about early Novi. The area's first settlers were Erastus Ingersoll, his wife and nine children. Early landholders were John Gould, Benjamin Bentley, Pitts Taft and Joseph Eddy. When they arrived Novi was part of Bloomfield Township. An act of the legislative council approved April 12, 1827 established the town of Farmington. At this time the present towns of Commerce, Milford, Lyon and Novi became part of the newly formed Farmington.

Records from the earliest elections in Farmington were destroyed by fire in 1872. It is known, though, that one early official was William Yerkes, one of Northville's northside settlers in 1825, the father of William P. Yerkes, president of the village of Northville in 1869. The township's first school opened in 1827 on the property of Pitts Taft. The Taft property was in the vicinity of today's Lexington Commons. The first teacher was Hiram Wilmarth of Farmington. Classes ran from November until February 1828. All this information and more is available in the *History of Oakland County, Michigan* which is available at the Northville Historical Society Archives, Mill Race Village.

# Put tragedy aside and move on

To the editor:

It saddens and angers me that after 15 months and a negligent homicide conviction we're still reading about the "Jogger death case." It was a terrible and tragic accident; it was never proven in court that Ken Loveday purposely drove his Jeep into Yusuf Hanania and Albert Abdelnour. The stretch of Eight Mile where the accident occurred has had four near-fatal accidents in the same place in the last six years. It is a highly trafficked residential area with a speed limit of 40 miles per hour and the roadway at that location is very narrow with guardrails and ravines. It is not a safe place to walk or jog.

Ken Loveday did not flee the scene of the accident, freely answered police questions and took a Breathalyzer test within a few hours of the accident. He was put in jail July 2, 1991, and except for being out on bond prior to his trial in February 1992, has spent all this time in jail.

Ken Loveday was charged with manslaughter but convicted of negligent homicide because there wasn't enough evidence to convict him of the more serious charge. He is not a convicted murderer seeking an early out through parole, but a prisoner convicted of negligent homicide who has served his time and deserves to be granted parole.

It is a tragedy that the families of Yusuf Hanania and Albert Abdelnour must now live without them. It is also a tragedy that Ken Loveday lives with the burden of knowing that he struck and killed these men accidentally.

My heart goes out to the families; they have suffered a great loss. Unfortunately, pursuing other legal remedies, civil suits and grievances, will not bring these men

back but will keep the pain and grief alive. I think we need to move on.

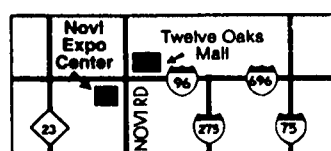

## Proposal D has negative aspects

To the editor:

On Nov. 3, Michigan voters have the option of voting "yes" or "no" on Proposal D which would amend Michigan's Auto No-Fault Law. The so-called highlight of the proposal would be an estimated average reduction of automobile insurance rates by 20 percent for policyholders accepting a reduction in their No-Fault Benefits from the present unlimited amount to a \$250,000 maximum.

Unfortunately, the Proposal also permits policyholders to waive residual liability insurance (public liability). It allows insurance companies to charge additional pre-

miums for optional no-fault medical coverage which you now receive automatically by law. It limits fees paid to health care providers rather than paying reasonable and medically necessary costs as is required presently, and finally, it limits the rights of an injured person to sue by setting a higher, vague standard for injuries.

The temptation of a quick reduction in auto insurance premium rates is an illusion as there is no guarantee that the rates will drop an average of 20 percent nor is there anything whatsoever that prevents insurance companies from raising the rates 20 percent or more six months after the proposal becomes law.

In the opinion of the undersigned, Michigan voters should vote "no" on Proposal D, as too many of their rights are given up for what in all likelihood would be a temporary decrease in automobile insurance premiums. Furthermore, increasing the number of uninsured drivers on the road is a disturbing thought.

## Facts show true picture of recreation

To the editor:

In response to Mr. Soelhner's letter to the editor on Sept. 24, my recollection of *The Northville Record's* article regarding City Council's support for the Recreation Commission's financing proposal is that it was accurate and, therefore, I must assume Mr. Soelhner simply misread it.

It may be helpful to restate the facts:

1. The Recreation Commission proposes to partially finance the Beck Road Park with \$109,000 in park development funds generated over the past several years from recreation programs' user fees.

2. The balance of the \$300,000 project is proposed to be financed by a bank loan over 10 years to be funded not by taxpayer obligation bonds, but by increased annual user fees to be paid by Northville recreation program participants. No bonds, no millage increases.

3. Since the Recreation Commission cannot, on its own, borrow money and since the Beck Road property deed restricts its use to public recreation (thus preventing the park from being used as colla-

teral) the debt must be the general obligation of the Township. Thus the user-fee funding mechanism.

4. In order to assure an income stream from user fees sufficient to service the loan, the Township Board requested a commitment from Northville City Council that it will continue to participate in Northville's joint services recreation program. Such a commitment, which we believe has consensus support from City Council, does not by the way obligate the City government to any direct financial support for the Recreation Department's administration on a proportional basis with the Township. It may be of interest to note that the total 1992 financial contribution to Northville Parks and Recreation from the city is \$66,700 and \$107,900 from the Township.

Hopefully this clears up any

misunderstanding that may have resulted from the recent coverage in the Record. If, on the other hand, the implication is that the Beck Road Soccer/Baseball Park is somehow inappropriate for this community, we clearly have a major philosophical disagreement. If that is the case, please consider the following:

Hopefully we can easily dispense with the concern about location. First, it's the only land the Township owns which is available for park development. Second, that location is significantly safer by any criteria than any of the Training Center fields off Sheldon Road or the Hines Park (NRA) fields.

The need, based on increased program participation and long-term availability of borrowed land for baseball and soccer fields has been well-documented over the past several years. Whether you agree with the need depends, I suppose, on whether you perceive these activities to be essential or even desirable. My view as a parent

and supporter of youth sports is that the developmental benefits of team play and individual fitness provided by these activities make them an essential part of the community. I believe it is true that kids who are busy get into less trouble than those who are not, and those who are physically fit are likely to be better students and better citizens than they would otherwise be. Failure of a community to provide recreational facilities can be likened to a school system's failure to provide sports and co-curricular programs. There is a direct effect on those that would have participated and an indirect effect on the rest of the population. It is often the indirect side effects of vandalism and disruptive behavior that affect all citizens.

Unfortunately the voters in this community have failed to support recreational millages in the past and, therefore, we have settled on user-based financing. Clearly, we would much prefer to be paying cash, but the need is now and we believe this approach is a practical, though partial, solution to this community's need for these recreation facilities.

I will not hesitate to suggest that the residents of this community need to tax themselves for recreation facilities just as they need to do so for schools and a library. If the peculiar demographics of Northville, where it is said 70 percent of the households are childless, are preventing such support, we are being short-sighted. In the long

run this community won't be able to stand behind its reputation as a great place to raise a family. It is ironic that Northville has become such fertile ground for anti-tax activism which may very well destroy that reputation. We, all of us, have an obligation to the children and their development. Don't deny them the opportunity to play, to compete, and to be part of a team.

### WTUA steps up, but township steps back

Boy, this hiring bit would be a lot easier if everybody would just leave us alone.

That thought likely has been rattling around the collective nogginns of local politicians of late, as their days in power fade and tumble like leaves from a frost-shocked maple.

Seems the good ol' folks at Northville Township and the Western Townships Utilities Authority just can't do much of anything without the public and press prying into their business. See for yourself:

Stunned at the response to their first try at bids for a big-dollar operations and maintenance contract, WTUA has decided to rebid the thing, hoping upon hope it can get more than old standby Ayres, Lewis, Norris & May to respond. The lack of response shouldn't come as a surprise to anyone; the way qualifications were weighted initially, WTUA couldn't even give the appearance of a fair bidding process.

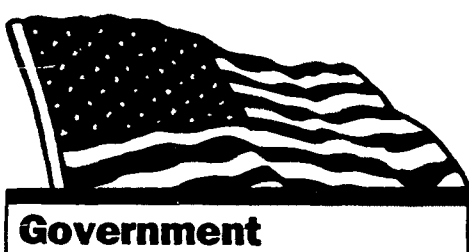
The sewer authority simply can't emerge as a beautiful butterfly from its cocoon of cronyism if it's clear a process was weighted toward an old friend.

Even WTUA Chairperson Tom Yack was in a dither after he found out how the operations and maintenance bid process was handled. Hearing that WTUA Executive Director Deloris Newell accepted bids on deadline day and vamoosed without opening the documents — ignoring standard government practice everywhere — Yack sighed, "That's not how we (at Canton Township) would have handled it."

So Yack's scrambling to get the WTUA house in some semblance of order, and that's a positive step. He and the WTUA commission decided to shelve the old bid process and actually go out and aggressively seek out new bidders (what a concept!). A committee will ponder the reasons why only ALNM and one other firm bid on the project, and the eventual hiring will be conducted by the new WTUA board. Makes sense.

Cut to Northville Township.

Officials there are running around like chickens with their heads cut off



over the hiring of a new Water and Sewer superintendent. Do we accept resumes and interview candidates or not? How do we do it? Should it be the old board or the new board's call? Does anybody really know what time it is?

First of all, veteran township government watchers can see through this one like it was a thin pane of glass. The township obviously wants to jam someone into the job before the new board takes over and assumes complete control. The superintendent's slot is a crucial one, heading up a department that, quite frankly, no one seems to know a lot about, though the department operates on a huge multi-million-dollar budget.

The Water and Sewer Department head should have critical insight into the whole WTUA situation, lap-in fees, and that nagging, quirky little agreement inked recently by the township and Browning-Ferris Industries.

Of course, it's better for the old guard if their concerns are represented in the department. Some meddling newcomer just might decide to start asking embarrassing questions.

Here's our advice to the township, though we know how they always listen to us: Please scrap any plans to shove one of your own into the Water and Sewer job. Let the new board plant its own crops and harvest the result.

After all, this is a department where waste — especially a politically motivated hire — is a terrible thing to mind.

### Community news tries to serve



Newspapers like this one are called "community newspapers" by folks in the news business.

We're not like the big daily newspapers like the *Detroit Free Press* and *Lansing State Journal*, which try to cover the nation, the world, Michigan and the region. Nor are we like the TV stations, which try to do the same thing using the medium of television rather than print.

Community newspapers are rooted in the local communities they serve. They try to cover whatever goes on in their home towns, from the city council meetings to the 50th wedding anniversary of that nice couple down the street.

We try to be part of the community we serve. Often we have our office in town. We like to hire editors and reporters who live in the community. We believe that we can practice community journalism with a combination of objectivity and fairness and also a sense of responsibility to the community we serve and to our neighbors who often appear in our news stories.

This is hard to do. In fact, I think community journalism is the toughest kind, if only because lots of the people you run into every day know just as much about the story you wrote as you do. And when you make a mistake, it's easy for them to charge into your office and chew you out face to face.

Here's an example of how we try to do our job, contributed by Phil Sherman, editor of our newspaper in West Bloomfield. It describes the way we covered the dramatic murder of a local resident and the aftermath.

The young children of the victim testified at the trial of the

accused. The presiding judge asked the media not to take their pictures.

Sherman wrote: "We saw no gain by putting a little boy and girl through such scrutiny after they had just watched their father die. We reported the story thoroughly without diving into the gruesome, sensationalistic tone the other media took, particularly when they snuck out to the side door of the courtroom and tried to snap pictures of the children."

"At the funeral, which took place in a church," Sherman went on, "several news organizations tried to go inside. We did, too, and the person leading the services asked us to leave, which we did — quietly and peacefully."

"That's in contrast to the television camera team that was forcibly thrown out of the church for standing its ground, and the other camera team that caused the widow to break down crying when they chased her out to the hearse after the service."

Sherman concludes: "Through all this, we still managed to cover the story but in a kind, thoughtful manner."

"We ALWAYS consider the human angle when approaching a story, and ask ourselves if we would want someone covering our lives the way we plan to cover their lives. If the answer is yes, we go ahead. If the answer is no, we scrap the plan and come back with a more sensitive approach."

Sure, as community journalists we make our share of mistakes, some of them pretty bad. But we try our damndest to live up to the difficult standard of being both journalist and member of the community we serve.

And when we do our jobs as well and as sensitively as Phil Sherman and his staff, there's nothing that can compare.

## THE GENERAL ELECTION A Comparison of Property Tax Proposals

The proposals House Joint Resolution-H and Cut and Cap will appear on the November 1992 ballot.

### PROPOSAL: HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION-H (HJR-H)

#### Explanation:

HJR-H limits home property tax<sup>2</sup> assessment increases to 5 percent per year or the rate of inflation, whichever is less. When the home is sold it is re-evaluated to reflect its market value.

#### What is the cost to the State of Michigan?

HJR-H does not cost the state any money and could increase state tax revenues. Instead, HJR-H limits how much local government can increase the assessed value of property. HJR-H does not limit how much voters can

increase their own millage tax rates.<sup>3</sup>

#### What is the cost to Northville Public Schools?

For every 1 percent increase in SEV, above the 5-percent<sup>4</sup> cap, Northville Public Schools will be unable to collect \$200,000<sup>5</sup>

#### Is it a tax cut?

HJR-H limits home assessment increases. It does not limit millage rates.

#### What does it mean to the Northville community?

If inflation (and consequently

the cost of running local government) increases beyond the 5-percent assessment limit, or if student population grows, local millage rates may have to be increased to maintain programs and services

### PROPOSAL: CUT AND CAP

#### Explanation:

Cut and Cap is Gov. John Engler's plan. It calls for a 30-percent cut in school<sup>7</sup> property taxes. The cut would take effect in stages over the next five years. The state would reimburse the schools for the 30-percent cut. At the same time property assessment increases would be capped at 3 percent per year, or the rate of inflation, whichever is less. The property would be re-evaluated when sold.

#### What is the cost to the State of Michigan?

This proposal initially would cost the State \$424 million in 1994. Ultimately it will cost 1.7 billion annually.

Governor Engler expects the plan would be funded by economic growth in the state. This growth is expected, in part, because lower property taxes will hopefully attract businesses to the state.

#### What is the cost to Northville Public Schools?

This proposal transfer control of \$7 million dollars from the Northville area to the state government.

For every 1 percent increase in SEV, above the 3 percent<sup>4</sup> cap, Northville Public Schools will be unable to collect \$200,000<sup>5</sup>

#### Is it a tax cut?

Cut and Cap calls for a 30-percent cut in school property taxes,

plus a 3 percent cap on assessments, until the property is sold. If the tax cut is not replaced with economic growth, Cut and Cap would be funded by program cuts in other areas or a state increase.

Cut and Cap does not cap millage rates.

#### What does it mean to the Northville community?

Cut and Cap would cause a decrease in tax money from commercial and industrial property since this plan caps all property

assessments — business and home.

Cut and Cap does not solve the funding inequity between wealthy and tax-base-poor school districts. Even after the reimbursement for the cut funds, the inequity in funding remains. This inequity is the reason legislators give for "Robin Hood" plans.

However, Cut and Cap does not prevent the Legislature from rechanneling current state aid from Northville to other districts.

### WAYS IN WHICH HJR-H AND CUT AND CAP ARE THE SAME

HJR-H and Cut and Cap will cause unequal taxes between similar properties if those properties were purchased at different times. Properties would be re-evaluated at the time of sale.

HJR-H and Cut and Cap offer NO protection from Robin Hood plans<sup>6</sup>.

HJR-H and Cut and Cap do not require the state to make up for revenues lost by Northville schools, city,

township, or county due to the cap. The Homestead Property Tax Credit program would reduce the property tax relief for some individuals.

Two other proposals, Olmstead/Keamey and Knowledge is Democracy's Safeguard, will not appear on the November ballot. Supporters are developing language and gathering signatures for possible placement on a future election ballot. Potential impact on Northville is unknown at this time.

### FOOTNOTES

(1) A Joint Resolution means that this proposal has the approval of both the State House of Representatives (where it originated) and the State Senate.

(2) Property taxes have traditionally funded local counties, cities and schools, they have not gone to the state. Income to the State of Michigan principally comes from sales taxes, income tax, business tax, transportation taxes and the lottery.

(3) A millage tax is a percentage of a property's assessed value. It is collected annually by local cities, schools and counties. A tax of 1 mill is \$1 per \$1,000 of property assessment. For example, if a home has a market value of \$100,000 the assessed value (State Equalized Value — SEV) is 50 percent of that amount, or \$50,000. Therefore, a 1.0-mill tax on \$50,000 is \$50. Thus, 30 mills of tax on a \$100,000 (market value) home would result in 30 x \$50 or \$1,500 per year.

SOURCE: Northville PTA Legislation Action Network

(4) This might be slightly higher due to the sale and re-evaluation of properties. The cap on reassessment does not apply when a property is sold. At the time of sale, the tax assessment will be set at 50 percent of the market value of the property, not at the cap.

(5) This figure is based on the current millage and SEV of all property in the Northville community (SEV — see endnote 3).

(6) A "Robin Hood" plan refers to legislative action which takes money away from wealthy school districts and gives it to poor districts.

(7) There is no cut to city, township or property taxes.

### Important to understand the issues

To the editor:

May I respond to Robert Bernard's letter printed in *The Northville Record* Oct. 1. In this letter, Mr. Bernard asks a number of questions of the PTA's Legislative Action Network about the November ballot tax proposals. I think I can answer them.

Mr. Bernard,

You are right to ask the question, "Help me understand..." One of the reasons many of us don't understand the tax proposals is that they are not as simple as their names imply. I have studied and written about these proposals for a little over two months now. I recently helped my elderly mother vote an absentee ballot for the November election and the wording for Proposals A (HJR-H), and C (Cut and Cap) were intimidating. With all my study, and with access to the actual proposals and legislative analysis from both sides, I did not understand the ballot wording.

Because of these issues, as a writer, I volunteered my services to the PTA's LAN to help write and edit the material you read in *The Northville Record* last week. One of the things I fought for was a series of 14 footnotes which helped explain the comparison chart. Without the footnotes I was totally lost. Even this morning, as I write this, I have to refer to the footnotes. But the footnotes were not included in the *Record's* comparison chart. So, we were trying to help you understand, but evidently there was not enough space in the newspaper. Additionally, the *Record*, even with its best intentions, deleted some critical information from the chart, and misplaced copy under the wrong heading. I was confused... and I wrote most of it.

Please forgive me for communicating "tremendous half-truths, innuendos and misinformations." I took information directly from the state documents on both sides of the issues. The LAN committee extensively sought counsel from attorneys and others to make the wording absolutely accurate and fair. The LAN asked me to remind everyone that LAN meetings are always open to all who want to attend. Come see how half-truths, innuendos and misinformations are crushed, mangled and destroyed. The next meeting is Oct. 29, 7:30

p.m. in the high school forum. There is also a Town Meeting Oct. 21, 7:30 p.m., in the high school auditorium.

To help you understand I will try my best, again.

You asked, "Why was the Olmstead/Keamey proposal included when it is not on the ballot?" LAN felt it was necessary to include the O/K explanation (as well as the KIDS proposal explanation) because voters needed to know that something more equitable for all schools was in the works and that Proposal A and C were not the only choices.

You asked how Northville Public Schools could be unable to collect \$200,000 when there is a cap on SEVs. It happens this way. The cost of running schools will continue to increase due to an expected influx of students and inflation. If inflation is above 3 percent then the cost of running schools will increase faster than what the SEV base can collect in taxes. The SEV base (and millages) fund 96 percent of Northville Schools. So, school funding will steadily fall behind as inflation increases above 3 percent.

You asked how Cut and Cap (Proposal C) could take an additional \$6 million to \$7 million away from Northville. What happens is that Cut and Cap transfers control of \$7 million from the Northville area to the state government. Cut and Cap does not prevent millage rate increases to make up the difference, as you imply, but we're not likely to vote for millage rate increases, are we?

Your final question asks about the reduction in tax money from commercial and industrial property. The Cut and Cap proposal will reduce the amount of taxes collected from commercial and industrial property. You are right that the proportion of tax revenue from commercial and industrial properties will remain the same. What LAN said is that there will be a reduction. Commercial and industrial property taxes contribute a large proportion to school taxes.

By the way, manure makes great fertilizer. It helps crops grow strong and healthy. Yes, manure stinks and taxes stink. Some things in life are neither fun nor pleasant though at the same time they are good and beneficial. A disciplined life is a hard life, but it's a good one too.

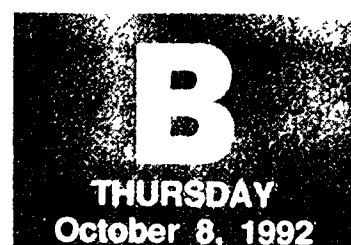

Abigail Adams, a pioneer in the women's-rights movement in the late 1800s, looked across the ballroom at the Northville Woman's Club luncheon last Friday and smiled.

She smiled because she was proud of the strides these women had taken to hold true to their ideals, and proud that the words she spoke more than a century ago were heard.

She sat dressed in an iced pink satin skirt topped with a white lace collar and blouse and watched as the 168 active club members, with a host of past presidents and life and associate members, waltzed into the Holiday Inn in Livonia to lunch.

The luncheon — which featured Past President Gladys Weiss role-playing as Adams — was intended to mark the centennial celebration of

the Northville Woman's Club, a Northville-based educational meeting group for women.

In notation of the centennial, club members took a stroll back in time to present "Celebrating Ourselves — Retrospective Vignettes," a skit that brought to life the reactions of some of the club's founding members to the advances women have made since the suffrage and women's rights movements.

The skit featured the comments of prominent women like Lucy Stout Dowd, the founder of the club, and a list of her successors, which were and are still legendary names in the community. Researched and written by Kathy Leo and Diane Rockall, the skit featured the voices of the late Edith Yerkes, Dr. Mary Lapham, and Mary Ambler, Narcia Dubuar, Minnie

## Rundell makes stage call for volunteers

Jacquie Rundell, who is president of the community's little theater group, the Northville Players, has two problems. One is how to attract new members to work on and off stage, and the other is where to find a permanent place to put the stage.

About money, the Northville Players do get income from advertising in their programs and the \$1 admission charge. So where does the money go? Mostly, Rundell said, "It's for ordering scripts, and we do have to rent the lights, too," and, of course, pay rent for the location.

Many of Northville Players' productions have been melodramas because it was thought to fit the Victorian nature of Northville. Rundell, however, would like to vary the offerings and also put on comedy and plays that are better known.

But without more volunteers and a permanent — low-rent or rent-free — location, the future for Northville Players is dimmed.

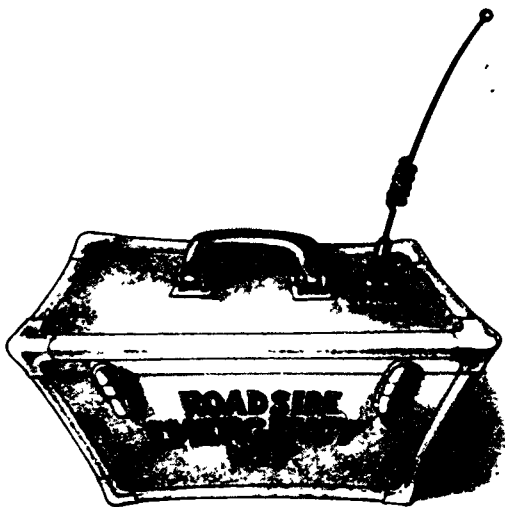

Ely, Kittle Sessions and Flora Babbitt.

Weiss traveled all the way from Cherokee Village, Arkansas to be with her fellow club members on this, the opening luncheon of the club's 100th year. Now a lifetime member, Weiss was happy to be home.

"It's wonderful to be back and to see all of you," she told two of her old friends as they embraced and chatted.

Weiss' thoughts were echoed by former President Marion Crump, who responded on behalf of all the past presidents.

"As a past president, the one thing that I really love about the Woman's Club is being remembered. When we get a copy of (membership annual books), we are all still listed," Crump said.

"That means a lot. Even in our operated state, we are still so proud of the club members and how they worked so hard."

Everywhere the eye traveled Friday, outsiders saw the same kind of sisterly exchange and the warm camaraderie that has become commonplace among the most elegantly dressed club members.

The sisterhood and the allegiance which club members share stems from the high ideals on which the group was founded in 1892. Back then, when the women's rights movement was making ripples in the tide, middle-class women across the country convened in activities and clubs with purposes akin to Northville's. Women then, as they do now, used the club as both an educational and social outlet.

Founding President Lucy Stout Dowd organized the local club on the

premise that women would use its membership to broaden their horizons and educate themselves about current affairs. Her purpose has stood steadfast over the years as the club's ideals were passed on through generation to generation.

Today the club's membership, which is exclusive to Northville women, encompasses first-, second-, and third-generation members. Club members meet 12 times a year from October to March to learn something about a current issue or topic. Each meeting welcomes a new and different speaker as ladies' lunch with tea.

Club President Mary Louise Cutler said the club's charter dictates its parliamentary format, but its flair is purely the product of its membership and of the times.

"The women enjoy going out for educational meetings and visiting

with each other," Cutler said. "It's an opportunity to get out, have some activity and meet with some friends."

Over the course of the last century, Woman's Club members have spent hours learning about social and educational issues and topical and timely news events.

"We try to bring in various speakers to appeal to the interests of all the members," Cutler said. "It's an occasion to go out and dress up. It's really something special for all of us."

Cutler said the club has remained exclusive to Northville and has been a popular attraction for middle-aged and older women in the community. Members must be sponsored by an active member in order to be welcomed. The club's bylaws limit its membership to 175 members. The club is just shy of its quota this year, and Cutler said there are a few openings.

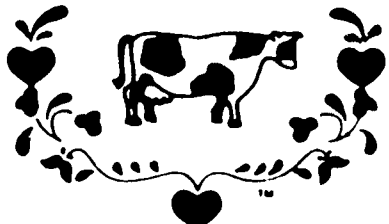

# Dollmakers show their wares at Muriel's

World-renowned doll artists Hildgard Gunzel and Brigitte Deval will autograph their sculptured and hand-painted dolls this Sunday, Oct. 11, at Muriel's Doll House in Plymouth.

Both artists are known for their artwork which exemplifies attention to detail and natural expression. They will be at the Plymouth shop from noon to 4 p.m. to autograph their work and to give brief presentations about the dolls they've created.

Gunzel is best known for her dolls marketed under the Alexander Doll Co. label. Her designs are featured across the world and her technique of using wax over porcelain is a breakthrough concept in three-dimensional doll design.

Gunzel, a native of West Germany, studied dollmaking at the German Master School of Design. Each doll is

meticulously styled with a human hair wig and a delicately hand-painted face graced with the finest gowns of batiste, faille and pure cottons.

Deval made her first doll at age 6. Since then she's built a career on her talents as a dollmaker. Each doll in her collection is unique and full of expression. The heads, hands and feet are modeled in clay and dipped in liquid wax so that the skin surface is a slightly textured silk matte, similar to the feel of real skin.

The vast varieties of blown-glass are made for her by an Italian specialist. The socks are all finely hand-knit cotton or silk, knitted by a neighbor. The shoes are hand made of real leather by a cobbler in Bavaria, where she lives. She also designs the wigs using mohair and undyed human hair. Her doll's outfits are made

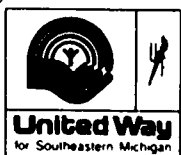

**Q: Our family is going to Vermont this fall. Any tips on activities that will interest the children?**

**A:** Don't miss the Crowley Cheese Factory in tiny Healdville, Vt., which is just outside Ludlow and northwest of Springfield. It is the oldest cheese factory in the United States.

Founded in 1882 the factory has workers who still make cheese by hand — same as in the 19th century. There is a display of tools used in early factories and in home cheese making.

Visitors can stand in the factory — where the action is — and sample the product. Admission is free Monday through Friday, but the cheese is usually done each day by 1 p.m. For further information contact the factory at (802) 259-2340. Information is also available from your local travel agent.

**Q: Can you recommend a Christmas cruise that offers top-quality entertainment?**

**A:** Victor Borge, famed pianist and humorist, is scheduled to entertain passengers aboard two upcoming Panama Canal cruises on the Seabourn Pride, which is on the Seabourn Cruise Line.

Borge will perform aboard the ship's 18-day Christmas cruise (Dec. 19 to Jan. 6) from Los Angeles through the Panama Canal to Barbados in the British West Indies.

**Q: On a trip to England we were impressed with the professionalism of London cab drivers. How do they qualify for the job?**

**A:** London taxi drivers must know the city well. To earn a license, would-be drivers first register with the Public Carriage Office and then spend up to four years learning London, inside out.

This phase of study is called "doing the knowledge." Students learn the streets of London on a bicycle. Finally they must pass a rigorous examination.

City laws regarding taxis — or Hackney Carriages, as they are officially called — date back 300 years. They state that a driver must take passengers wherever they want to go, provided the journey does not exceed six miles.

About 20,000 taxi drivers presently work in London. There are approximately 15,000 vehicles. London cabs are checked regularly and must be immaculate and in perfect working order.

## Getting a sense of the real Florida

### State parks, nature trails replace theme parks, traffic jams in Jacksonville

Although 2.6 million visitors poured into the city last year — many of them through the two dozen entrances into Jacksonville from Interstate 95 — the city has never had the cachet of the tourist mecca farther south.

About 25 miles south of the Georgia border, Jacksonville is 350 miles north of Miami and does not have that area's tropical climate; it felt none of the fury of Hurricane Andrew.

In winter the temperatures can be a little nippy for snowbirds, even if the chill lasts only a few weeks and certainly isn't cold by northern standards.

The flip side to having motorists barrel right by you is that sunning and bicycling can be enjoyed year-round on the area's wide, clean and uncrowded beaches and, though summer is the high season, there is usually ocean bathing through October.

Fall and winter can be good for golf. Average lows in the winter months are 42 degrees, with highs in the mid to upper 60s.

There is a sense of the real Florida here too, devoid of theme parks and traffic jams. The area is rife with state parks, nature trails, pine wilderness and, especially, water.

The St. Johns River, at 275 miles the longest river wholly in Florida, bisects the city, and there are numerous other rivers, creeks and streams as well as, of course, the ocean and the Intracoastal Waterway.

Jacksonville and St. Augustine, about 30 miles south, are often referred to as the First Coast. First because this area is often a motorist's introduction to Florida. But there is also its history.

Jacksonville, named in 1822 for Gen. Andrew Jackson, was first inhabited by the Timucua Indians who lived along its waterways. In 1564 the Huguenots built Fort Caroline, the first Protestant colony in the United States here. The French soon lost that foothold in America, however, to the Spanish, who destroyed the fort.



The 61-acre Jacksonville Zoological Park is home to more than 700 animals and birds, including Chilean and American flamingos.

In 1565 the Spanish built the colony of St. Augustine, which became America's first permanent European settlement, now usually called America's oldest city.

Jacksonville, known here as Jax, is spread over 834 square miles and is the nation's third largest city in area after Juno and Anchorage, Alaska.

Called by some Florida's business center for its many insurance and banking offices and headquarters, the city's population grew by almost 25 percent over the last decade, thanks to business expansion and the many new companies moving into the area.

The city also has several well-regarded hospitals and medical centers, including one of only two branches of the Mayo Clinic outside Rochester, Minn.

Three military installations, including the Mayport Naval Station, home of the aircraft carrier Saratoga, round out a diverse economy, and a variety of attractions that include a jazz festival.

#### SIGHTS

The Jacksonville Landing offers retail shops, sit-down restaurants, a food court and several pushcart vendors. There's often live music in the evening and at lunch hour.

On the west side of the city, along a portion of St. Johns Avenue, The Shops of Avondale offers about 60 specialty stores and restaurants in restored buildings.

There is an abundance of high-end antique and gift shops here, the latter featuring an interesting array of furnishings for warm-weather climates. While there, old-house buffs

can admire the many handsome homes of this historic district, most of which date from the early days of the century.

On the south bank of the St. Johns, across from Jacksonville Landing, is the Riverwalk, a 1.1-mile boardwalk offering magnificent views of the city's skyline. Behind the boardwalk are office buildings, restaurants and a few shops.

The Museum of Science and History, 1025 Museum Circle, (904) 396-7062, and the Alexander Brest Planetarium, 1025 Museum Circle, (904) 398-7827, are at the western border of the Riverwalk. Admission is \$5 for adults, \$3 for senior citizens and children from 4 to 12 years of age. That covers entrance to both the museum and planetarium. Hours are Monday through Friday, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., Saturday 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.,

and Sunday 1-6 p.m. The museum is scheduled to be closed until Sept. 25 for annual repairs.

Sixty-seat water taxis running every 20 minutes offer visitors a breezy ride from the Landing to one of three stops along the Riverwalk. Round trip: \$3.

About 10 miles north of the downtown area the 61-acre Jacksonville Zoological Park — 8605 Zoo Road, (904) 757-4466, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily — features rides on a miniature train around the grounds, a boardwalk through Florida wetlands, a petting zoo and a high wooden boardwalk above an "African veld," an 11-acre savannah that includes ostriches, gazelles and antelopes.

Among its more than 700 animals are rare scimitars and one of the few families of marabou storks raising offspring in captivity in this country. Admission: \$4 for adults; \$2.50 for children 12 and under; \$3 for senior citizens 65 and older.

The beach communities of Atlantic Beach (somewhat arty), Neptune Beach (residential) and Jacksonville Beach (the largest), and a mix of both, plus the usual food stands, surf shops, etc., known as the Beaches, lie 12 miles east of downtown and run about 15 miles along the ocean. Parking very close to the sand is rarely a problem.

North on A1A from the beach communities is Fernandina Beach, at the Georgia border and about 35 miles from downtown Jacksonville.

Centre Street, the main thoroughfare, has been spruced up and is now an attractive shopping area in keeping with the rest of the district.

A day-trip must be St. Augustine, northeast Florida's principal tourist attraction. This town of 12,000 is a fascinating mix of the architecturally and historically outstanding Flagler College, the Lightner Museum, the tourist shops along St. George Street, the arty charming houses along narrow streets and mews and the kitschy Ripley's Believe It or Not Museum.

## British countryside is best seen on walking tour

The village of Hathersage, in Derbyshire, England, is a quaint settlement of stone cottages with gardens of peonies, nasturtiums and marigolds.

The air is fresh and sunshine is strong in a nearby churchyard with the grave of the man immortalized as Little John in the legend of Robin Hood.

Next to the church is the Old Vicarage where Charlotte Brontë discovered a local family named Eyre. Soon after, she wrote her classic novel "Jane Eyre."

Hathersage is the quintessential English village, a perfect place to go walking in the country under the gentle guidance of a company called The Wayfarers.

There is probably no better way to see the British countryside than to walk through it, taking time to see the landscape, history and people.

What's more, the concept of walking permeates English literature, from books by Wordsworth and Coleridge to contemporary writers such as John Hillaby, who describes traversing the country, and John O'Grada.

It's common in Britain to get exercise and fresh air by walking, whether alone or in a group. In rural areas men and women in their 70s often outpace younger walkers.

The British Tourist Authority says about 21 million Britons — nearly 38 percent of the population — are regular walkers.

A number of American and British companies offer organized walking tours of the land, but few are as well known as The Wayfarers.

Founded in 1984 by Peter Clifford, Christopher Hague and Michael West, the company received the Queen's Award for Export Achievement in 1991, a rare honor for such a small business.

"One day it's Concorde and Clar-

idge's, the next day it's stepping in cow dung in a field," says co-owner Michael West. "I can't tell you how many people say it's the best vacation of their lives."

West — who says he "would die" if suddenly he had to go on a cruise — spent 20 years organizing corporate conferences before retiring to start The Wayfarers.

The company now has 10 different itineraries in England, Scotland and Wales. The trips bear names such as "James Herriot's Yorkshire," "Thomas Hardy's Dorset," "Wordsworth's Lake District" and "Cornwall — Creek and Coves."

The style of walking is gentle and leisurely — through villages, over stone walls, through fields and across hills, dales and valleys. An average daily trek covers eight to 12 miles; participants should be in reasonably good shape.

On a recent walk through the "Derbyshire Dales," 52 miles were covered in five days. The walk was led

by Malcolm Saunders, a former city planner who is now a walk leader with great knowledge of local architecture, flora and fauna.

The walk covered a part of Britain few Americans seem to visit: Derbyshire, located roughly between Sheffield and Manchester, with the Peak District National Park at its center.

"Half the population of England lives within 50 miles of the park's borders," says Saunders. Yet it is a remarkably rural part of the land.

The participants also visited Chatsworth House, home of the Duke and Duchess of Devonshire and arguably Britain's greatest country house. They crossed medieval packhorse bridges, identified flowers and photographed sheep.

In 1992, 53 walks were scheduled. The most popular was "A Cotswold Way," with 14 departures. Next year The Wayfarers is going, among other places, to the Isle of Mull in the Hebrides and the Loire Valley in France. Two guides accompany each walk.

One stays with the group; the other drives a support van, handles luggage and meals and generally helps things run smoothly.

The week-long trips begin with dinner Sunday, followed by five full days of walking. The adventures end after breakfast Saturday.

Accommodations are in comfortable English country inns.

All meals are included, as are morning and afternoon refreshments, usually served from the tailgate of the accompanying station wagon or van. During the day this vehicle also picks up tired walkers.

In 1993 the cost for each trip will be approximately \$1,300 per person; air fare and transfers are extra. Departures are late April through mid-October. It's not too early to think about reserving a space this year.





## Tankers take second at Fenton Relays

A second-place finish at the annual Fenton Relays highlighted the Mustang swim team's week.

Northville took the second spot from among 12 schools with 274 points at the Saturday meet. Grand Blanc won the meet with 320 points.

"They swam well," coach Bill Dicks said. "They swam as fast as they have all year."

The coach described the meet as being competitive. Schools such as Grand Blanc and Milan always have good teams, Dicks added.

Northville's best finish came in the 200-yard backstroke. The team of Rebecca Anderson, Meagan and Katie Goble, and Jodi Wesley won the event in 2:00.16. That time broke the old meet record by more than two seconds.

In the 400 medley relay, Wesley, Jill Walro, Brenda Newton and Da neen Lang placed third in 4:34.70. Shelia Osborne, Katie Goble, Katie Rompel and Andrea Moretti were third in the 200 yard freestyle in 1:50.71.

In the 400 IM, Anderson, Amy Kohl, Rompel, and Mandy VanHorn took yet another third in 4:45.47. Northville got another first place in the 850-yard crescendo relay with Osborne, Cook, Lang and Megan Goble. The set the meet record in 9:11.12.

In the 800 freestyle, Newton, Kohl, Rompel and Lang placed third in 8:58.06. VanHorn, Walro, Mary Rivard and Chris Parry were fifth in the 200 yard breaststroke in 2:35.69.

In the 400 freestyle, Wesley, Newton, Moretti and Megan Goble took second with a time of 3:56.27. In the 200 butterfly, Julie Tharp, Tammy Cook, Anderson and Moretti were fifth.

Northville took third in the meet's final event, the 200 medley relay. Katie Goble, VanHorn, Cook and Kohl swam a 2:05.80.

"This gave them a chance to sharpen their racing skills," Dicks said.

The difference in the meet was a pair of relays. The Raiders posted season-best times in the 200-yard freestyle and the 400-freestyle to get the win.

## Mustangs play for division title

Friday night's Homecoming football game with Walled Lake Western could be one of the most memorable in years for Northville High.

The Mustangs have a chance to capture the WLAA's Western Division crown—for the first time ever. Northville earned that shot Saturday with a 19-14 upset victory over Livonia Franklin on the road.

"He's becoming one of the bigger threats as a quarterback," said coach Darrel Schumacher. "He puts a lot of pressure on the defense."

Walsh and company will have to play as well or better Friday to beat the Warriors. Western is atop the division at 3-0, tied with Northville. Walled Lake is 5-0 on the season.

"We are enjoying the moment," Schumacher said. "But the moment doesn't last long when you look ahead [to Western]."

The coach described Northville's win Saturday as an upset. Franklin boasted a much larger and physical team than the Mustangs.

Statistically, the size mismatch showed. Northville managed just 142 yards of total offense, compared to Franklin's 266.

"Special teams won the game," Schumacher said. "We had little offense, but we were able to get point off of the kickoff return."

Although Livonia had the size advantage, he said his team was faster than the Patriots.

"They are big and strong," Schumacher commented. "But we knew we had better speed. I think it wore them down as the game went along and helped us."

Livonia miscues also played a key role.

Northville was forced to punt after three downs on its first possession of the game. The Mustangs got the ball right back, on the Franklin 4-yard line, on a fumble by the Patriots.

On second down of the short drive, Walsh hit running back Kevin Shaw for a four-yard TD pass at the 8:12 mark. The locals led 6-0 after an extra-point attempt failed.

Livonia appeared it would tie the game near the end of the first quarter.

The home took the ball after Northville's score and promptly marched down to the Mustang 14-yard line. The 14-play drive stalled right there, though, and Livonia tried a 31-yard field goal and missed. The quarter ended at 6-0.

The teams traded possessions in the second.

With more than half the quarter gone, Franklin took over on its own 36-yard-line. Five plays later, Eric Holmes scored on a 10-yard run and gave Livonia a 7-6 halftime lead.

Walsh worked a little of his magic to start the third quarter.

The senior took a good Franklin kick at his own 10-yard line and ran straight up the middle of the field. Walsh then broke a couple of weak tackle attempts and was off to the races for 90 yards and a touchdown.

"It was just what the doctor ordered," Schumacher said.

Northville has had lots of luck on returns against Franklin in the last few years. Former Mustang Bill Kelley and Walsh have both had returns for TDs in the last two years against Livonia.

A two-point try failed and Northville led 12-7 just seconds into the final half. But that lead didn't last long.

The Patriots put together a nine-play scoring drive on the ensuing kickoff. Franklin quarterback David Little connected with Josh Reynolds on a 38-yard pass for the TD at the 7:48 mark of the third.

Schumacher said the fact that his team was unable to stop Livonia to that point caused him great concern. But, he added, the Mustangs proved to be equal to the challenge.

"For some reason," Schumacher said, "the kids responded beautifully."

The winning score came about five minutes later.

Northville started on its own 35-yard line. After one first down, the Mustangs were forced to punt from their own 48.

Schumacher pulled out his bag of tricks for a fake punt, however, and Rob Subotich was able to run 24 yards for a first down. After another fourth-down conversion, Walsh ran nine-yards on a sneak for the winning score.

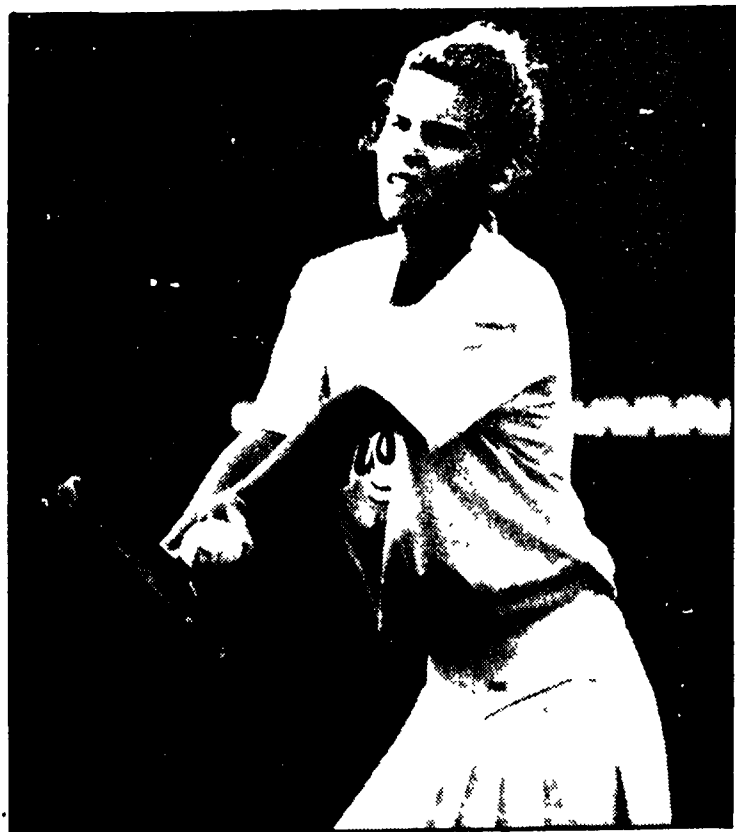

## Children should learn about nature

When our parents took us out on "nature walks" to point out the burst of wildflower growth, the ugliest bugs, the brightest stars, there wasn't this sense of urgency of, "Look at this now — it may not be here to show your own children."

But to take a child out on such a walk today, or even to do some wandering with a friend to take a closer look, maybe that very walk is the sort of thing it takes for us and our children to learn how to make sure those birds and flowers are there for the next generation.

In order to respect something, you have to understand it. And the first step in understanding is going out and taking a good, close look.

We did this yesterday. My two small children, the puppy and I headed down the road to our nearby "field," little more than an unbulled lot about the size of three home sites. By this time we did some crawling around: over here was a hole... a rabbit's warren?

"No," said the two-year-old with authority, "that's a squirrel house."

His imagination or was he teaching me something I hadn't noticed on our walks before?

Next we came in close on a tall weed and took a look at the tiny purple flowers you don't notice from a distance.

"It smells prettier than the daisy flowers," noted the four-year-old.

It had never occurred to me to tell her before that different flowers smell different.

Within a half hour we found a tiny sky-blue eggshell on the ground, to be taken home and compared to those in our bird book.

We looked at one end of a storm drain pipe on the street and followed it to its end, where runoff dripped into the canyon, opening up a discussion of where the suds from washing the car end up: next to flowers, squirrel houses and birds' eggs.

Learning about birds, native flowers, local wildlife, even whales, can be as simple as our walk, or as elaborate as a college extension course.



It's important for children to understand nature.

Does your town have a natural history museum? You might not know that museums, aquariums, sporting goods and nature-oriented stores often offer field trips to learn about local flora and fauna. Many are geared toward older adults and children.

Local colleges and universities also conduct "nature tours" often in conjunction with research expeditions. Contact nearby schools for their curriculum catalogs.

### A Nature Vacation

Along the West Coast from Mexico to Alaska, in the St. Lawrence Seaway in Canada, and in Hawaii, whale-watching day trips and excursions are available in virtually every town with a port. This is a magnificent experience, and worth planning

a trip around.

Where *The Whales Are* by Patricia Corrigan (The Globe Pequot Press) is a good guide that includes a calendar of whale migrations.

If this summer's vacation is a trip to the cabin, take a hike with the specific intent of finding animals' habitats. *Animal Tracks and Traces* by Kathleen V. Kudlinski (Franklin Watts) is a new book that teaches children and their folks how to become adept at spotting the subtle signs of the animal life all around them.

Or make it a collecting walk: Once, in Hawaii, I picked one of each different kind of flower I encountered on a one-mile walk. By the time I reached my destination, I could no longer hold all the blossoms. Try this in the

mountains with leaves, or out in a field picking different grasses.

"Gardens for Growing People" (Box 630, Department CN, Point Reyes, Calif. 94956-0630) is a children's gardening supplies mailorder business that offers not only wonderful seed collections, gardening tools and books for kids, but also a Backyard Explorer Kit for collecting and identifying leaves, cones and pods — perfect fun for a vacation. Send for their small catalog.

### Backyard Naturalist

You needn't leave home, though. With a magnifying glass, binoculars, perhaps a box in which to bring things home for examination, and a kid's curiosity (whether or not you have a kid), you can collect enough rocks, flowers, insects and maybe even a lizard or two right in your neighborhood.

If you don't have a science and nature-oriented store nearby, check into what the local toy store has in stock for exploring the outdoors. Today, you can even buy a microscope for the cost of a doll.

Next, perhaps a trip to a bookstore if you'd like to specialize in, say, stargazing. Books on astronomy, like anything else, can be unbelievably complicated and discouraging, so consider the children's and young adult's section of the bookstore for more elementary (and often more colorful and interesting) explanations of what you're looking at.

One we particularly like is *Night Sky Gazing* because its constellations not only depict the figures they were originally named for, but glow in the dark as well.

If you're of a teaching bent, *Nature with Children of All Ages* by Edith A. Sisson (Prentice Hall Press) is a hands-on guide to taking a closer look at everything from mud to mudhens. Any kid stumped for a science project would find inspiration aplenty here.

Even if you live in downtown Detroit, you can learn more about the outdoors simply by hanging a bird feeder just outside the window. Bird-watching isn't something you need to join the Audubon Society to do.

## Fall sports lead to many injuries



When fall arrives, so does participation in the two most popular contact sports — football and hockey. Minor injuries of the ankle, knee, shoulder are relatively common in these sports.

Thankfully, serious injuries are much more rare. What happened last

year to Mike Utley of the Detroit Lions reminds us of the catastrophic injuries that may occur in these sports. Life-threatening sports injuries usually involve the head or neck. Other sports that are relatively high risk are diving, gymnastics, rugby, basketball, wrestling and, of course, boxing.

In the United States, about eight high school football players die each year from injuries. An additional 50 players fracture their neck and of these, 10 are permanently paralyzed. Several injuries in football occur when players use their heads as the initial contact point when tackling or blocking.

Much more common than neck fractures are

concussions. A concussion is any change in mental condition after a blow to the head. This can be unconsciousness, amnesia (memory loss) or confusion. It is estimated that there are 250,000 concussions a year in football alone. Although usually not serious, concussions can cause death. Even more disturbing are the cases of young athletes who have a concussion, seem to recover, and then have a second, less serious blow to the head and die of brain swelling. This has been named the second-impact syndrome.

These cases have led the Colorado Medical Society in 1991 to publish guidelines for the management of concussions in sports. All coaches, trainers and physicians who treat athletes should be familiar with the guidelines. Parents of athletes should know that concussions are potentially serious injuries and that their child should be evaluated by a physician if a concussion occurs.

The guidelines are based on the seriousness of the injury. A grade one concussion results in confusion with no amnesia or unconsciousness. The player should be removed immediately from the game. He should be examined and observed for 20 minutes. If the confusion is brief, no amnesia develops and no unconsciousness is seen, the athlete may return. If

any of these problems do develop, the athlete may not return. Before returning to the game the player should be exercised (sit-ups are best) and watched for return of confusion. Having the player run up and down the sidelines is not an adequate evaluation; sit-ups are much better.

A grade two concussion results in confusion and amnesia without unconsciousness. The athlete is removed from competition and not allowed to return. The player should be evaluated by trained medical personnel. The athlete can return to the sport after one week if there are no symptoms.

In a Grade Three concussion there is loss of consciousness. The player should be transported to the hospital from the field, by ambulance, with the neck immobilized. If the medical evaluation is normal the player may participate in the sport again after two weeks with no symptoms.

These guidelines should prevent the devastating and tragic consequences of the second-impact syndrome.

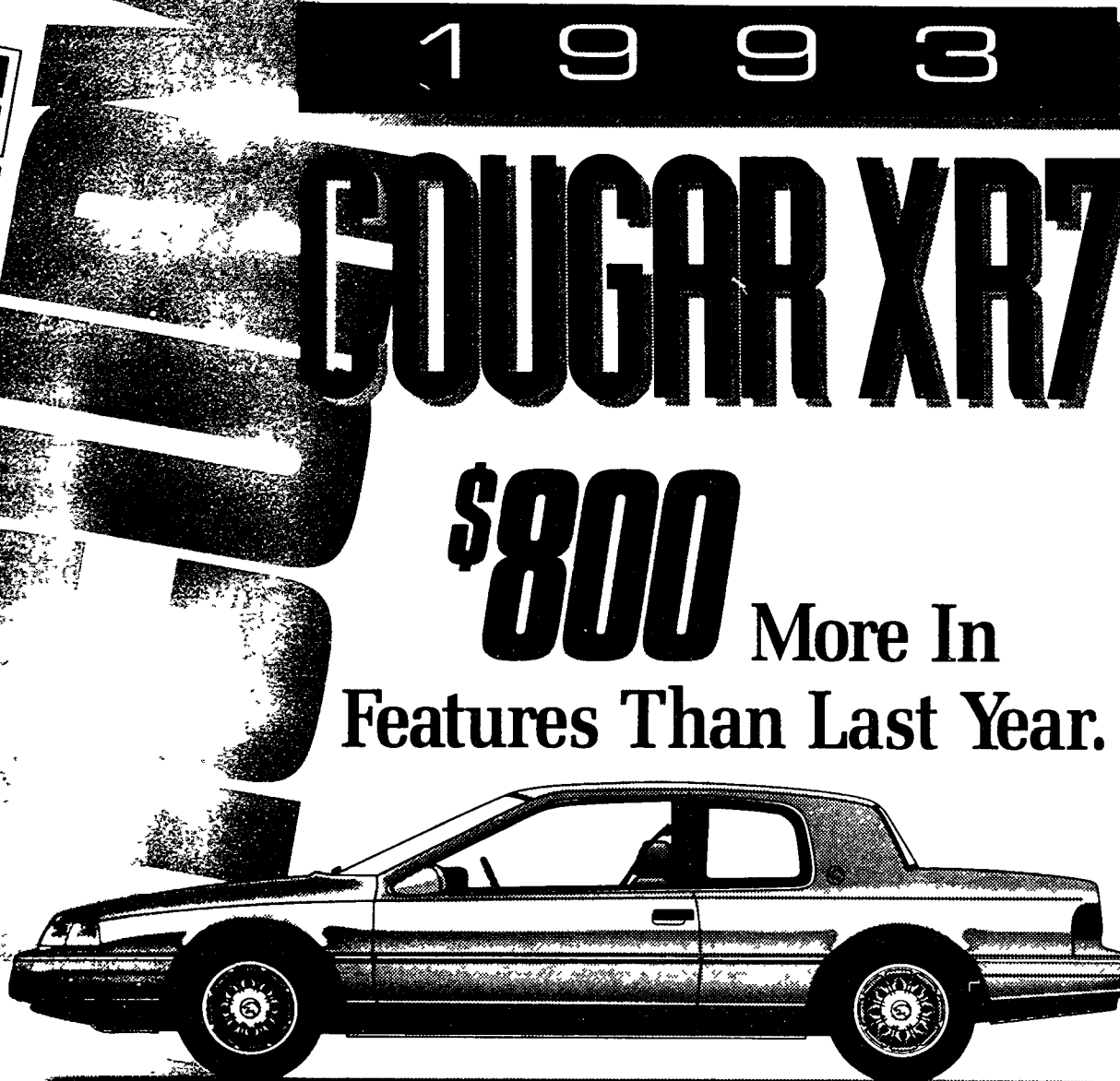

# Novi beats Lakeland 30-28

Novi's 30-28 Homecoming win over Lakeland Friday night came down to one thing: getting the job done when it had to be done.

The offense did its part as quarterback John Lahti hit junior Brian Csordas on a five-yard touchdown pass with four minutes left in the game. The defense then came up with the critical stop by forcing an incomplete Eagle pass on fourth down and goal from the four-yard-line.

"That's a big victory because they were undefeated and it puts us over the top," said Lahti, who threw for four TDs. "I think we have to be considered contenders now."

The win did push Novi over the .500 mark in the Kensington Valley Conference at 2-1 and 3-2 overall. Lakeland is now 3-1 in the league and 4-1 overall.

Coach John Osborne said it's still an uphill climb for the Wildcats.

"The league is on an up cycle right now," he said. "Everybody is good. (But) I'll be surprised if anybody can

beat South Lyon."

The 'Cats looked like they could've beaten anybody in the first quarter. The home team won the coin toss but elected to kick off. The Eagles started with the ball on their own 41-yard line and were promptly shut down on three plays by Novi.

The Wildcats then took the ball on their own 25-yard line after an Eagle punt. Twelve plays later Lahti hit tight end Kevin Serra for a six-yard TD pass.

Novi kept a 6-0 lead until the second quarter. Lahti and Serra hooked up for a second strike, a 25-yard pass, at the 9:20 mark to make it 12-0.

Lakeland got its offense on track in the second. The Eagles scored twice before the half closed on quick drives with Mollard and quarterback Guy Dufresne doing the damage. Mollard scored on a nine-yard run and Dufresne hit a wide-open Rob Furmanek for a two-yard TD to give Lakeland a 14-12 halftime advantage.

The hectic pace continued in the third.

Novi scored on its first possession

on a 15-yard pass from Lahti to Csordas at the 8:30 mark of the quarter. Mollard then countered with an 18-yard TD run to make it 20-18 for Lakeland.

The teams then traded scores to make it 28-24 in favor of the visitors with exactly nine minutes to go in the fourth quarter.

On fourth down from the five, Lahti rolled to his left, lofted a pass over a Lakeland defender and into Csordas' hands for the score at the 3:59 mark.

Unphased, the Eagles promptly drove to Novi's four-yard-line. On fourth down from that spot and 17 seconds on the clock, Dufresne sprinted to his left heading for the goal-line. As linebacker Pat Whitehead came up to stop him, the QB fired for the back of the end zone but missed ending the game at 30-28.

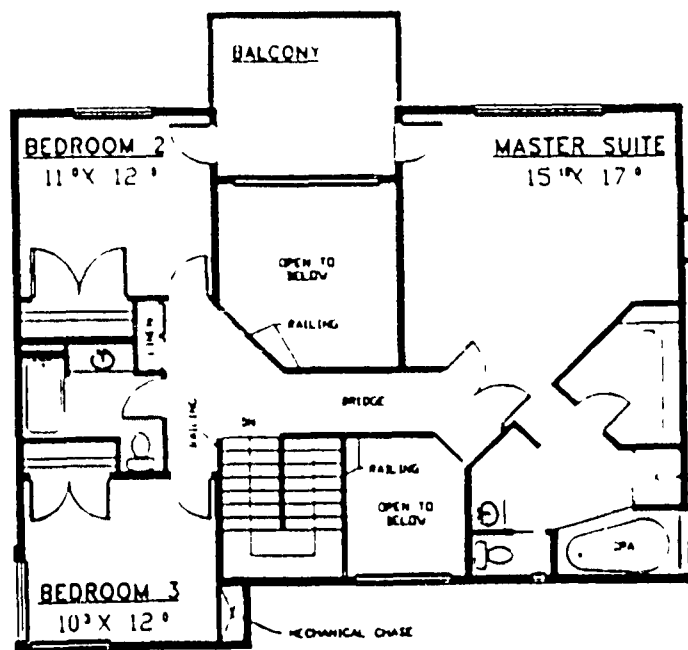
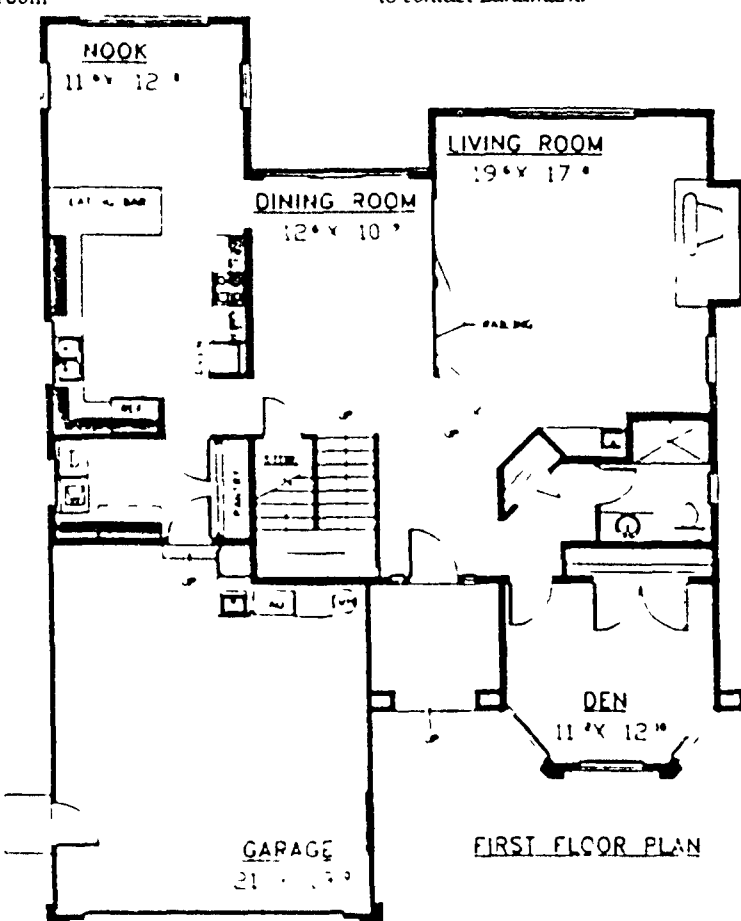
It also contains an attached two and one-half car garage, a separate 16-by-32 foot workshop, 20-by-25 foot gym, and

## Storing tubers

**Q. What is the best way to store bulbs and tender tubers for the winter?**

A. Tender tubers and bulbs should be dug up and stored for the winter before the frost hits in your area. Tuberos begonias, dahlias and cannas should be dug after the frost has blackened the leaves.

Be very careful when lifting these beauties to avoid bruising, and allow them to dry well before storage. Most tubers take about two weeks to cure. Store at 40 F to 50 F in sand and check occasionally during winter to make sure they stay in shape.

Unfortunately, once out of the soil most tubers and bulbs look pretty much alike, making identification of variety and color difficult.

Here's what I do to solve the dilemma. If you label your plants during the summer, it's easy to transfer the name or color of the variety directly onto the tuber using a felt-tip pen. Come spring, it's a cinch to plant the right dahlia in the right spot!

**Q. I would like to divide my peonies, but I don't know the proper time. Can they be divided at any time?**

**Can they be divided at any season of the year?**

A. Peonies can be divided in the early fall. Be careful when digging around and under the plant so you don't break off the roots. Wash off any soil that clings to the clumps and strip off all leaves.

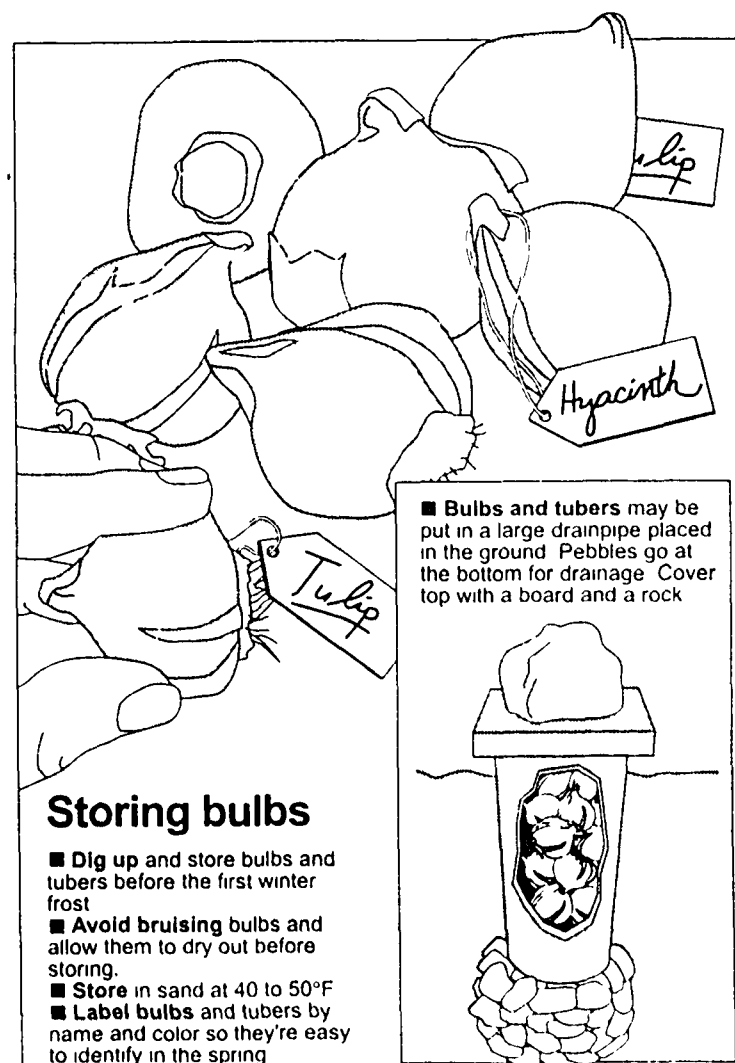
With a sharp, sterile knife, cut the "tubers" into sections containing three to five "eyes." Be sure each section has a tap root. After the cuts are made, check for signs of disease.

As a precaution, dust the tubers with Zineb, which can be bought in any garden shop. The tuber should then be replanted immediately in a sunny location, but never deeper than 1 1/2 to 2 1/2 inches in the ground.

**Q. I have a very rare species of a deep purple magnolia tree. Many of my neighbors are amazed at this particular type.**

When its blossoms sprout in and around April or so, depending on the weather conditions, its flowering buds open to a deep purple color. These petals are similar to the shape of a tulip on all the branches of the tree.

# Information form helps avoid the name game

It's amazing how a simple name mix up in a real estate transaction can cause major problems for buyers and sellers.

"One of the most common problems resulting from a name mixup is a delay in processing the closing of the transaction," said Daphney Hetherington, manager of Interstate Escrow Co. "And timing can be very critical in today's market when buyers want to benefit from a particularly low mortgage interest rate."

More serious problems surface when people become involved in court actions that lead to judgments against them. These judgments, in turn, become liens against any real estate they own or may acquire in the future. When one of these people is

mistakenly identified as a principal in a real estate transaction, it can set off a chain of frustrating delays and legal problems.

If there's a legal judgment against the seller of real estate, the property usually will not change hands until the judgment is eliminated or the matter is resolved to the satisfaction of all parties involved in the transaction.

Thousands of legal judgments are made in federal, state and local courts every day. It's important to determine whether the judgment against a person with your name is really you or someone else.

That's the purpose for the "Statement of Information" form that must be provided by property sellers

and buyers during the closing of many transactions. Filling out all the lines relating to personal identification, residences and occupations during the past 10 years, former marriages and other requested information can seem like a needless hassle, but it serves an important purpose.

Even though a name is spelled differently, if it sounds the same it may be considered the same person under law, it was pointed out by Larri Jones, a regional vice president of Chicago Title Co.

"In title searching, it's necessary to look at all possible variations of the name to protect the interests of principals in a real estate transaction," he said.

Forged or phony names are cropping up more frequently than at any time in history. Fortunately, most real estate transactions today are covered by title

insurance, which insures the existence or non-existence of rights to real property.

Title insurance also protects the policyholder against events that may not be obvious from checking public records, such as forgery or real estate fraud. If the title search misses a judgment against the seller because of confusion regarding his or her identity, that, too, is covered.

"During my 23 years as an escrow officer, I've seen a number of name mix-up cases that caused a lot of problems," Hetherington said. "But fortunately those cases are becoming more rare."

striking statement. It was a memento from a trip to Palm Springs, Calif.

An air of elegance pervades the formal dining room. The Gorneys selected an 18th century Drexel mahogany table and six chairs, with matching bureau and china cabinet. The oak floor is graced by a 9-by-12 foot, 100 percent wool hand-ruled rug. Crafted by Jim's mother in 1965, this artful rug contains a floral motif. Overhead, a genuine brass chandelier, with delicate droplets of porcelain petals, continues the floral motif.

The living room is as inviting as the dining room. Large windows and two skylights allow plenty of sunshine. "We wanted large windows," Jim explained. "I like a bright house," Rose added. "I can't stand the curtains to be closed."

A tapestry couch, an ornate teak table

dated late 1800, and a coffee table from Rose's parents stand like pieces of sculpture against the white walls and pale grey plush carpeting. An attractive two-way natural and gas fireplace constructed of flagstone, finishes the comfortable picture.

The room, Rose's favorite, has a separate seating area made distinctive with an archway. A doorwall leads to the rear decks and offers a view of the gardens. The walnut bedroom set was purchased when the couple were first married. Two original Hummel nightstand lamps are on the dresser. Jim bought them when he was stationed in Berlin while in the U.S. Army.

The master bath, decorated in mauve and grey, boasts a two person Jacuzzi.

"It's nice when I have a workout downstairs and come up and do the Jacuzzi for a while," Jim said. "Then I sit in front of the fireplace and watch television."

The Gorneys plan to live in this home for five or six more years. "It's our retirement investment," Rose stressed. "I really enjoyed designing the house."

"There is not a thing we regret," Jim added. "I just love the whole thing. It's a fun house to entertain in."

## Sofa is a valuable find

### ANTIQUES

**Q.** We inherited this sofa from my wife's grandmother. The rumor is that it is more than 150 years old. It is in excellent condition and has been reupholstered. I'm sorry that is all I know about.

**We would appreciate anything you can tell us. What would it sell for on today's market?**

**A.** The sofa is a fine example of a mid Victorian medallion back sofa. The maker is unknown. It was probably made around 1860 to 1880.

The value should run in the \$1,000 to \$1,200 price range.

**Q.** This hand-painted porcelain powder jar and hair receiver are marked with "R.S." in a wreath and "Germany" underneath.

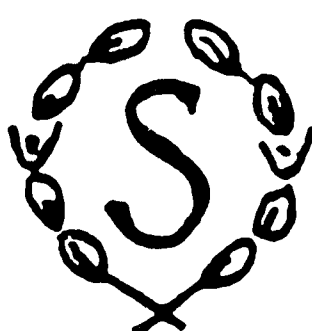
**Can you give me any information and the value of them?**

**A.** The Schlegelmilch family made fine-quality porcelain in several places in Germany. The pieces with this mark were made in Tillowitz, Germany, during the early 20th century.

Your two-piece set would sell for \$185 to \$200.

**Q.** I have a 13-1/2-inch cut-glass vase. This mark is inscribed on the bottom. It is the diamond pattern with hob stars near the pedestal.

**Can you identify this mark and maker? I would also like to know the value**



**of my vase and when it was made.**

**A.** Your vase was the work of H.P. Sinclair & Co. in Corning, N.Y., in the early 20th century.

Sinclair bought blanks from other manufacturers and designed and cut the patterns.

Your vase could possibly sell for \$365 to \$375 in good condition.

**Q.** I have a pair of wall pockets about 9 inches high. They have blue hands with flowers on a basket-weave background. On the back of them is a crown with "Amphora, Austria."

**I would like to know who made these, how old they are and how much they are worth.**

**A.** Your wall pockets were made by Riessner, Stelmacher & Kessel, who operated the Amphora porcelain factory in Teplitz, Austria. They were made between 1900 and

1915. They would probably sell for around \$225 to \$235 for the pair.

**Q.** I would like some information about a pitcher that was made by The Buffalo Pottery Co. It is 8 inches high. It is titled "The Fallowfield—Hunt the Return."

**Please advise the approximate value and date it was made.**

**A.** The Buffalo Pottery Co. was established about 1902 in Buffalo, N.Y., by The Larkin Co. to produce premiums to promote the sales of their soap products. Your pitcher was made about 1910.

It should sell for around \$500 to \$600 in good condition.

**Q.** I have an old brass candlestick-style telephone. It is in excellent condition. It has the following printed on its base: "Western Electric Co."

**I would like to know when this was made and its value.**

**A.** Your telephone was patented in 1904. Collectors seek all kinds and types of old telephones today.

Your telephone should sell for \$175 to \$225.

## It's not a long way to grow a Tulipifera

Continued from 1

It's just beautiful.

Once these petals bloom and fall off, the leaves sprout and open, and the tree looks so similar to a rubber tree plant. In some cases, it may bloom twice between the spring and fall seasons.

In the late fall, it produces a bright color of seeds shaped like a kidney bean.

I've tried to buy one just like it in many nurseries but can't find one. What I would like to know: Is there possibly a way to start up a new growth of this type of a tree? Nothing ever grows from its roots, e.g., new plant

I've tried a few ways:

- Planting the seeds in a container and keeping it indoors during the winter months.
- Cutting off a new growth of a branch, using rooting powder and planting it

But all of these failed.

**Have you any other suggestions or ways that you might know of? Please inform me. I'm so desperate. Thank you.**

**A.** Your beautiful magnolia tree variety is called "Tulipifera."

To start a new growth of this tree, plant your seed in a cold frame outdoors in the fall. If all goes well, they should come up in the spring.

Make hardwood cuttings in late fall—bundle and set in sand and put in a cold frame. Hopefully, they'll grow next spring, too.

year-round, those who lease equipment for long-term or seasonal projects, and those who take out short-term leases (one month or less).

"We have equipment for every type of contractor," he said.

The major advantage AIS customers enjoy are extensive service hours and speedy equipment repair turnover.

If necessary, Detzler said, product support personnel can work around the clock to service vital pieces of equipment. Regular service hours are from 6 a.m.-midnight Monday through Friday and 7 a.m.-5 p.m. Saturday.

"We're like a car dealer that handles 10 types of cars," Detzler said. Sales, repair facilities, rentals and parts are all available under one roof. In addition, equipment support personnel repair equipment in the field

when necessary.

Price ranges for purchase of equipment vary since AIS sells both new and pre-owned units. The smallest pieces of new equipment cost about \$20,000; other units can command up to \$1 million a piece. Most of the new equipment, however, range in price from \$100,000 to \$200,000. Used equipment usually is priced between \$10,000 to \$150,000 per unit.

## Michigan's a hot spot for RV camping

Whether it's hiking in the unspoiled woods of northern Michigan or taking a dip in crystal clear waters off the west coast, Michigan residents are learning that recreational vehicles will get them where they want to go comfortably and economically.

RVs are meeting the needs of families seeking the most from their leisure time. More than 500,000 Michigan residents own recreational vehicles, and one in every 10 U.S. residents drives an RV, according to statistics Michigan Association of Recreational Vehicles and Campgrounds.

The term "recreational vehicle" can refer to anything from a small towable trailer with only enough room to sleep to a luxurious motor home with all the comforts of home. Off-road vehi-

cles are not included in the definition. Towable trailers include folding camper trailers, truck campers, travel trailers and park trailers. Truck campers and travel trailers usually offer bathroom and kitchen facilities. Park trailers are the largest of the towables and can be used for seasonal or temporary living. Towables range in price from \$2,500 to \$75,000.

Motorized RVs include motor homes and van conversions. Average prices range from \$28,000 for compact models to more than \$100,000 for the most luxurious. For some, the loan interest can be tax deductible if the motor home qualifies as a second home.

Just as there are RVs designed to meet every need, there are places to camp in Michigan to satisfy every outdoor interest. More than 800,000 campsites are available in the state—50,000 of these sites are privately

owned.

The campgrounds vary from the most primitive to the most luxurious resort-like spots. They also offer a variety of activities to campers including fishing, hunting, hiking, swimming, boating and even horseback riding. Some campsites are even conveniently located near popular tourist attractions and some of the state's best golf courses.

These campgrounds offer families a quiet and relaxed environment to enjoy quality time together—a commodity in much demand during these hectic times. A University of Michigan study revealed that two-thirds of heads of households say camping is the best vacation a family can take. Last year, 18 percent of all American travelers camped.

While camping appears to satisfy our "purer" interests—fresh air, togetherness, etc.—it also appeals to

our financial interests. Camping is big business meaning "big bucks" for many smaller communities. In addition to the RV purchase itself, campers spend an average of \$61 per day on goods and services when camping—on food, campground fees, souvenirs. At an average of 23 days a year on the road, Michigan RVers spend more than \$72 million each year.

The popularity of camping in Michigan is evidenced by the placement of the state as the third highest in RV sales. Michigan follows only the hot-weathered states of California and Florida in recreational vehicle sales.

For those who are unsure about plunging into RV ownership, some dealers offer rental opportunities.

Blair Bowman said, "He was one of the key initial founding members of the thought process of transisting this into something bigger and better."

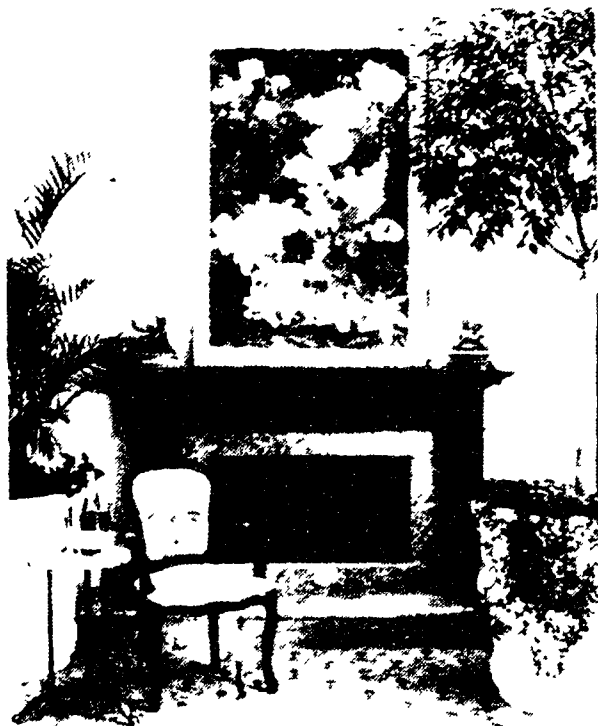

He is a continuing advisor."

Bill Bowman was approached by Frank Adell, executor of the Adell Brothers Children's Trust, to find a good use other than industrial for the Mohawk Liquor building, which closed its doors in 1989.

Bill Bowman is the past president of the Farmington Hills Chamber of Commerce and a leader and member of numerous other community as well as real estate associations.

Blair Bowman said the Expo Center will be great for the community as well as the business community.

"It's really a community program," he said. "The city has been a great support. It's going to be a positive thing for the total area."

Connie Mallett, executive director of the Novi Chamber of Commerce, was another driving force behind the Expo Center.

Her role began when she was approached by Thompson-Brown Realtors and asked if she was still interested in forming a Convention and Visitors Bureau.

She was. Mallett moved the Chamber of Commerce, which was located

at Novi Road and Grand River Avenue, to the Expo Center on Fonda Drive.

She attended the Expo Center meetings and gave her ideas to the committee.

Mallett became the executive director of the Novi Chamber of Commerce in 1986. She gained association experience putting in many years at the PTA and little league baseball. She gained even more experience as the international president for Parents Without Partners.

As international president she appeared on talk shows, traveled throughout the country and Europe and worked with a staff in Washington D.C.

"Our primary mission is to be the business voice of our members in the Novi community and help the atmosphere be good for business," she said.

Phil Morosco, general manager of Twelve Oaks Mall and Chamber of Commerce member, was important to getting the Expo Center going.

Morosco provided the business perspective of what benefit the mall and other businesses could provide to those working and attending the

trade shows at the Expo Center.

Morosco has been the general manager of Twelve Oaks Mall for five years. He was the general manager of Briarwood Mall in Ann Arbor previously, which is also owned by the Taubman Company.

The City of Novi was also a key to making the Expo Center happen.

Blair Bowman said the Novi City Council and Planning Commission were supportive.

Two city officials who were instrumental in the Expo Center project were Ed Kriewall, city manager, and Jim Wahl, planning and community development director.

Kriewall has been the Novi city manager for the past 18 years and has given his service to Novi for 22 years.

He said he helped the business and civic groups to communicate ideas for the center.

"It's one of the more exciting projects worked on in (the) community," he said. "We were tremendously excited about the Expo Center. It seems to be the right medicine for the ailing hotels in our community."

Wahl was active on the Expo Center committee.

The planning and community development department was able to get half a million dollar grant from the State of Michigan for road improvements to the entrance road for the Expo Center, Fonda Drive.

Wahl was involved in staff support, data generation and grant application processing.

"That department has been instrumental in making this project happen," Kriewall said.

Victor Cassis, owner of Victor's Novi Inn, was one of the first members of the ad hoc Expo Center committee.

Cassis became involved because he has an interest in having a banquet hall inside the Expo Center. He does not have the hall yet because he wants to see the center development first.

"You can see the potential as being enormous," Cassis said of the center. "We are hoping that it will keep growing and the potential will be realized."

Frank Adell, executor of the Adell Brother's Children's Fund which owns the building, wanted to put the building to some use other than industrial. Adell's presence was necessary to start the Expo Center.

# Adell: Expo is better use of building

There always has to be a dreamer before dreams come true.

Frank Adell — president and CEO of The Adell Broadcasting Company and WADL TV-38 which broadcasts from Mt. Clemens in partnership with WJBK TV-2 — is the dreamer behind the Novi Expo Center.

Adell has made other dreams come true as well.

After a nine year battle to obtain a broadcasting license that ended successfully in the United States Supreme Court, Adell built the only station in the U.S. that works with and promotes another television station in the same market.

WADL TV-38 is a CBS alternate affiliate that has the option to carry programming that WJBK TV-2 does not carry.

Adell is the executor of the Adell Brothers Children's Trust, which owns the Novi Expo Center building.

**NOVI NEWS:** How did the Children's Trust come to be in possession of the old Mohawk Liquor building?

**ADELL:** The Adell Children's Trust built the building in 1967 for Adell Industries, which was an auto parts manufacturer supplying General Motors, Ford and Chrysler . . . It's the children's trust of three brothers — Frank, Marvin and Robert.

**NOVI NEWS:** Why did you decide an Expo Center in the old Mohawk Liquor building was a feasible project?

**ADELL:** Simply the fact that Novi didn't need another shopping center on this corner, nor did they need a hotel. Having a 300,000-square-foot building used for a trucking company with the growth of Novi . . . the use of the building

should be put to better use.

**NOVI NEWS:** What have you done to put the Expo Center together?

**ADELL:** I and (Thompson-Brown Realtors President) Bill Bowman, Sr., took the concept to (Novi City Manager) Ed Kriewall. And with Ed Kriewall, (Director of Planning) Jim Wahl and Mayor (Matthew) Quinn, and those that are on the Planning Commission, it just grew. My involvement was just to bring it to the table. Since it was a valid concept, it was a natural use to (turn) a once warehouse into an Expo Center that would benefit the hotels, restaurants and shopping centers.

**NOVI NEWS:** What spurred your interest for this project?

**ADELL:** Approximately 15 years ago, I brought the concept to Novi and they said it was premature. In fact, Ed Kriewall said we don't have that many paved roads in Novi and it's a great idea, but it is just too premature. I believe timing is important since now is the time.

**NOVI NEWS:** What other projects have you been a part of?

**ADELL:** Building the last UHF television station in the Detroit area, WADL TV-38.

**NOVI NEWS:** Has the Expo Center lived up to your expectations?

**ADELL:** Yes, and more.

**NOVI NEWS:** How much renovation will be done to the building the Expo Center is in?

**ADELL:** I think it will be a continuous renovation. It will be growth as needed.

**NOVI NEWS:** What will the Expo Center do for the business community?

**ADELL:** It's doing it now. It's a magnet bringing people into Novi and helping hotels. The concept is totally different than having a musical event where a group will come into town with a business manager and take the money out in an attaché case. Those exhibitors who exhibit at the Novi Expo Center bring business into (the) community and the money stays in Novi. It doesn't leave in an attaché case with a promoter and a business manager.

**NOVI NEWS:** How much support have you gotten from the business community?

**ADELL:** One hundred percent.

**NOVI NEWS:** Some business people have complained that the Novi city government was too slow moving in getting approval for the Expo Center. What is your opinion on that?

**ADELL:** I never heard of that before.

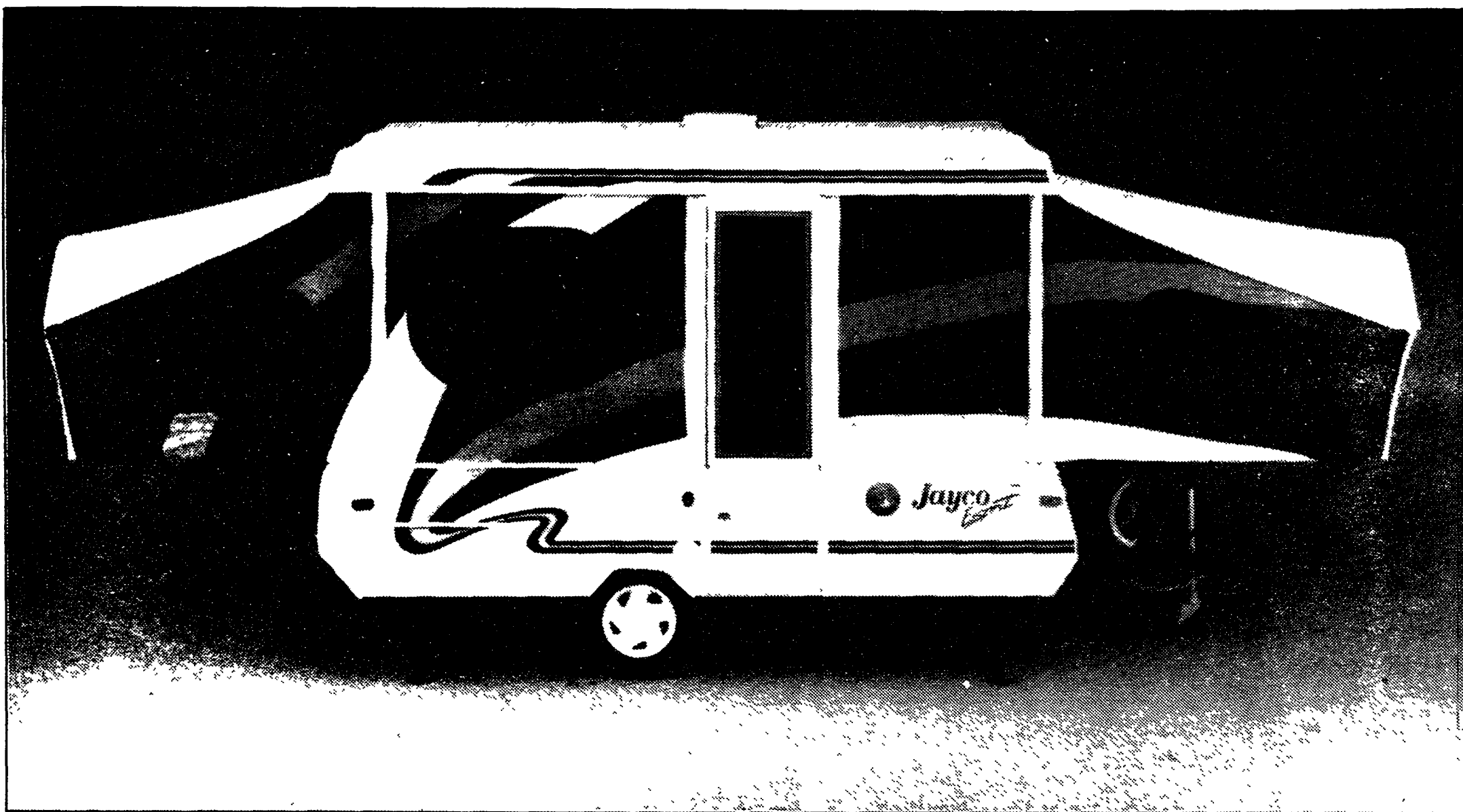
**NOVI NEWS:** What is your next project?

**ADELL:** Building a television super station like Ted Turner. It's on the drawing boards now.

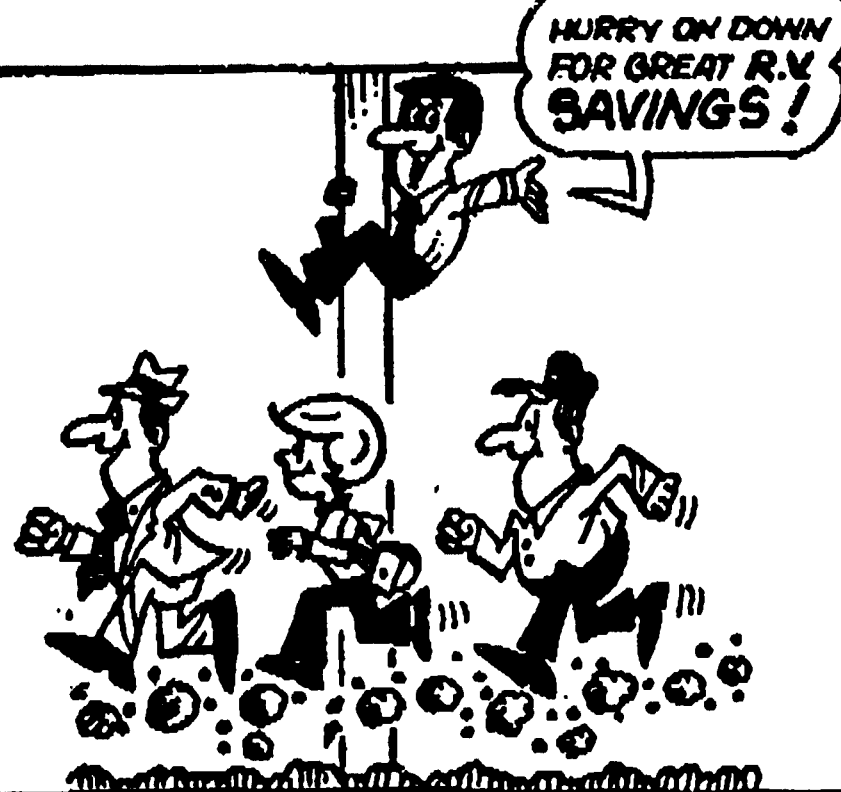

# Center will increase that 'tourism dollar'

People may not see Novi as the typical vacation hot spot where tourists, suitcases and kids in tow, head for a week of fun in the sun. However, Novi businesses have been earning "the tourist dollar" for quite some time now, according to the Novi Chamber of Commerce.

Connie Mallett, executive director of the Novi Chamber of Commerce, said that business income is counted as "tourism" revenue whenever the outside dollar is brought into the community.

"Novi probably would not be perceived as a tourist attraction or a place to go," Mallett said. "However, even before the Expo Center, what we saw in our office suggested that it was a tourist attraction simply because it had quality shopping, quality restaurants and quality hotels."

Mallett said the residents of five

surrounding counties regularly shop in Novi. She said people come from areas as far as Grand Rapids, Big Rapids, Muskegon, West Branch and other areas where there are not as many shopping centers.

She said people from these areas will not drive three hours and just turn back after a days worth of shopping. They often stay for a weekend in the hotels and want to know what else there is to do in Novi, Mallett said.

She said the Novi Expo Center, which will have a public grand opening with the RV and Camper Show beginning Oct. 10, will draw more outside people to Novi.

She said Novi residents will probably not be the attendees of trade shows at the Expo Center.

There are approximately 200 to 250 people employed in jobs related to tourism in Novi. The hotels, the Chamber of Commerce and the Novi Expo Center are considered tourism-related jobs.

Phil Morosco, general manager of Twelve Oaks Mall and chairperson of the Chamber of Commerce tourism committee, said it is still too early to determine how much more money Novi businesses will generate from Expo Center tourism.

He said the trade shows will probably have more of an impact on the hotels than the public shows, but public shows will also bring in tourist dollars to local businesses.

He said Novi gets the tourist dollar during the annual Michigan '50s Festival, softball tournaments and events sponsored by the hotels.

Morosco said that for every tourism dollar spent in the community, it will turn over three or four times.

This means that when the outside dollar comes into Novi, and is used to pay local business employees, they will again spend that dollar to buy within the community.

Mallett said that over 85,000 people attended the '50s Festival during

its five-day run this year. She said many of the people who attended were from outside the City of Novi.

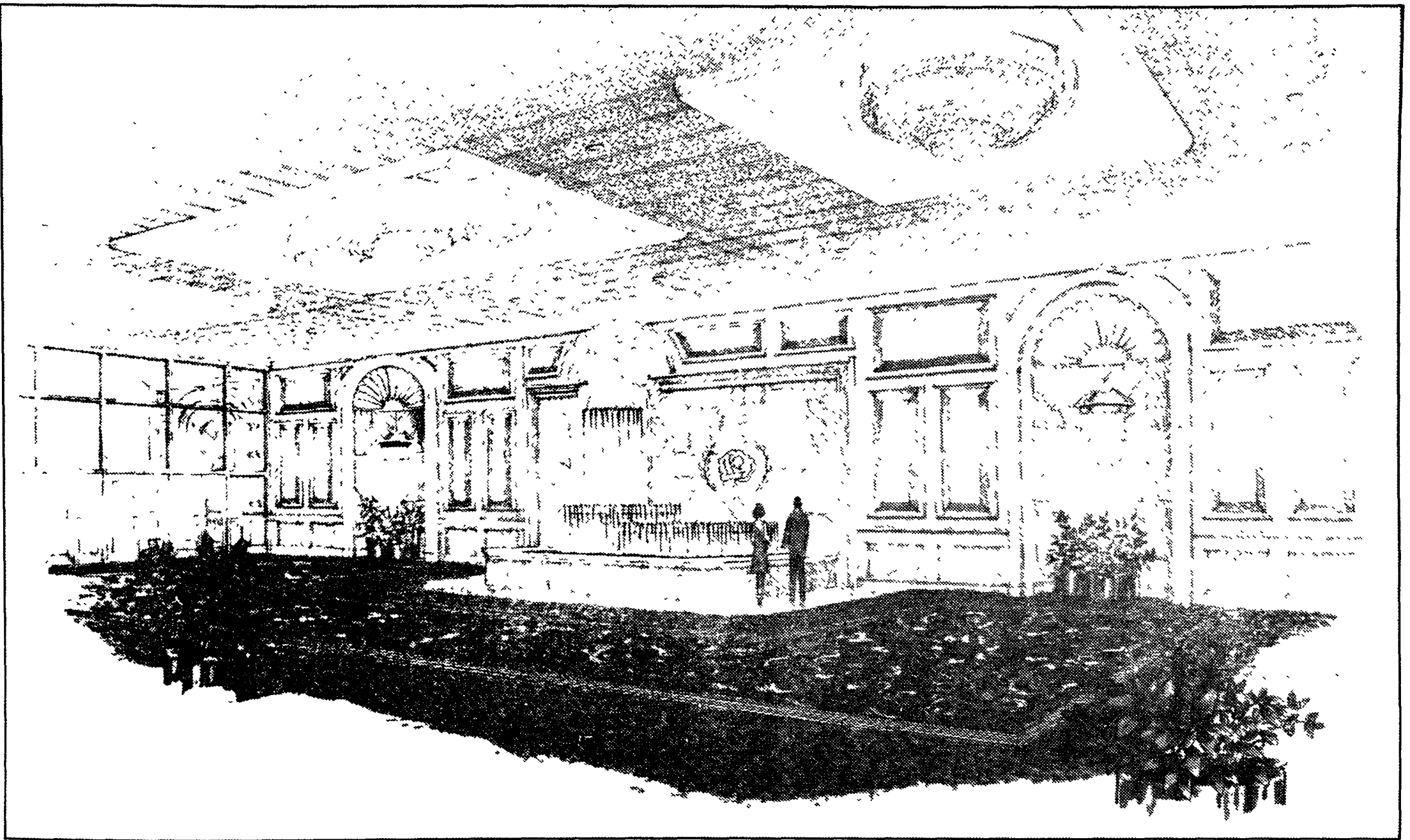
She said tourism is an important industry in many communities.

"Tourism is the second highest dollar business for the state of Michigan," she said. "Anything you can do to attract it is healthy for a community."

Tour buses, she said, may one day stop at the Expo Center's permanent attraction — the Motorsports Hall of Fame. However, the only tour buses that come to Novi now stop at the Sheraton Oaks Hotel and shuttle buses carry people to Twelve Oaks Mall.

The tourists Novi now attracts are not the traditional "rowdy" tourist that many people envision showing up at trendy resorts, Mallett said. Novi's tourists are often affluent senior citizens who want to take a day trip, so they hop on a tour bus so they do not have to drive.

# Businesses to benefit from spinoff

## Services will be needed by those at Expo shows

The Novi Expo Center will stimulate local business, according to the president of the Expo Center and the executive director of the Novi Chamber of Commerce.

Blair Bowman, president of the Novi Expo Center, Inc. said vendors, employees and exhibitors will come into Novi for days or weeks and stay in the hotels and patronize the restaurants and shopping areas.

"We have heard on many occasions people coming to shows say, 'Yes, I dropped off my wife or my husband's at the mall picking up some things,'" Bowman said.

He said a food trade show in April drew many people to such restaurants as Mr. B's Farm and Diamond Jim Brady's.

Bowman contended that as the center becomes more and more successful, there will be more business opportunities than can be imagined now.

"What I think is that it will solidify the business base that is already here," he said. "It is no secret that the economy is not the greatest. There is a tremendous concentration of various business entities in this area and this will provide another spark plug in that overall program to assist the current business base."

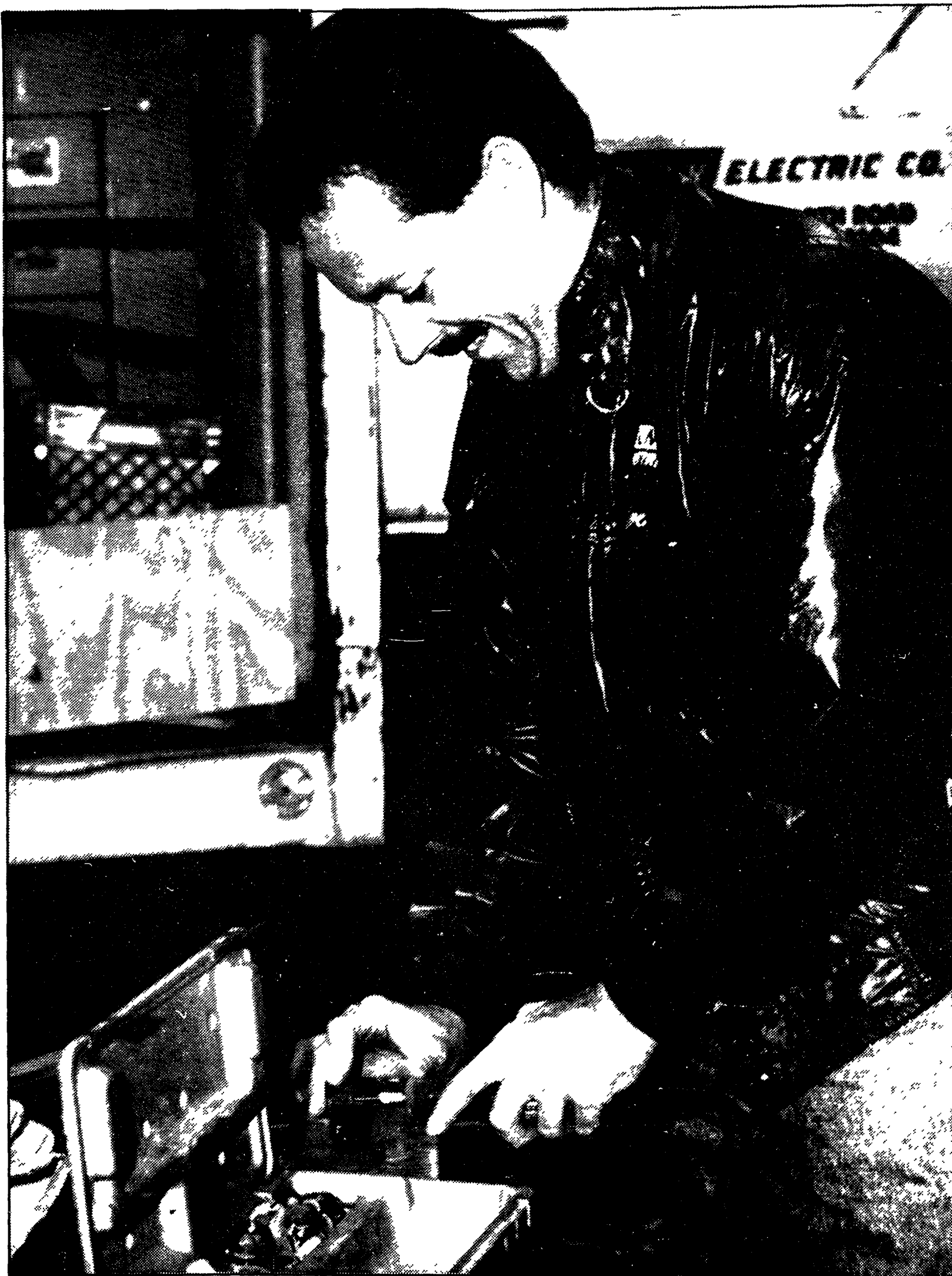
He said the building is more beneficial to Novi as an exhibition center than as an industrial facility because it will serve as a spur to that local business, which is much needed.

Connie Mallett, executive director of the Novi Chamber of Commerce, said exhibitors will have a need for printing, secretarial services or computer services, depending on the type of trade show. She said Novi will be the logical place for exhibitors to get these services because it is convenient to their exhibits.

Mallett said smart entrepreneurs would consider Novi a good city in which to start a new business.

Mallett herself saw the possibilities in Novi and organized the Convention and Visitors Bureau within the Chamber of Commerce, which will provide tours and answer visitors' questions.

Mallett said she saw an increase in the number of visitors coming to Novi as a result of mail and telephone inquiries and thought that if there was

a department within the Chamber of Commerce, it would be able to provide those services.

"I saw it as being a potentially good business to start," she said.

The Chamber of Commerce is a non-profit organization that gets 50 percent of its funding from its members and 50 percent from the events it sponsors.

Bowman said that he expects more employment opportunities as the Expo Center progresses, both within the center and in the surrounding area.

He said the resulting growth in jobs will not be so much in the Expo Center as they will be in the hotels, restaurants and shopping centers.

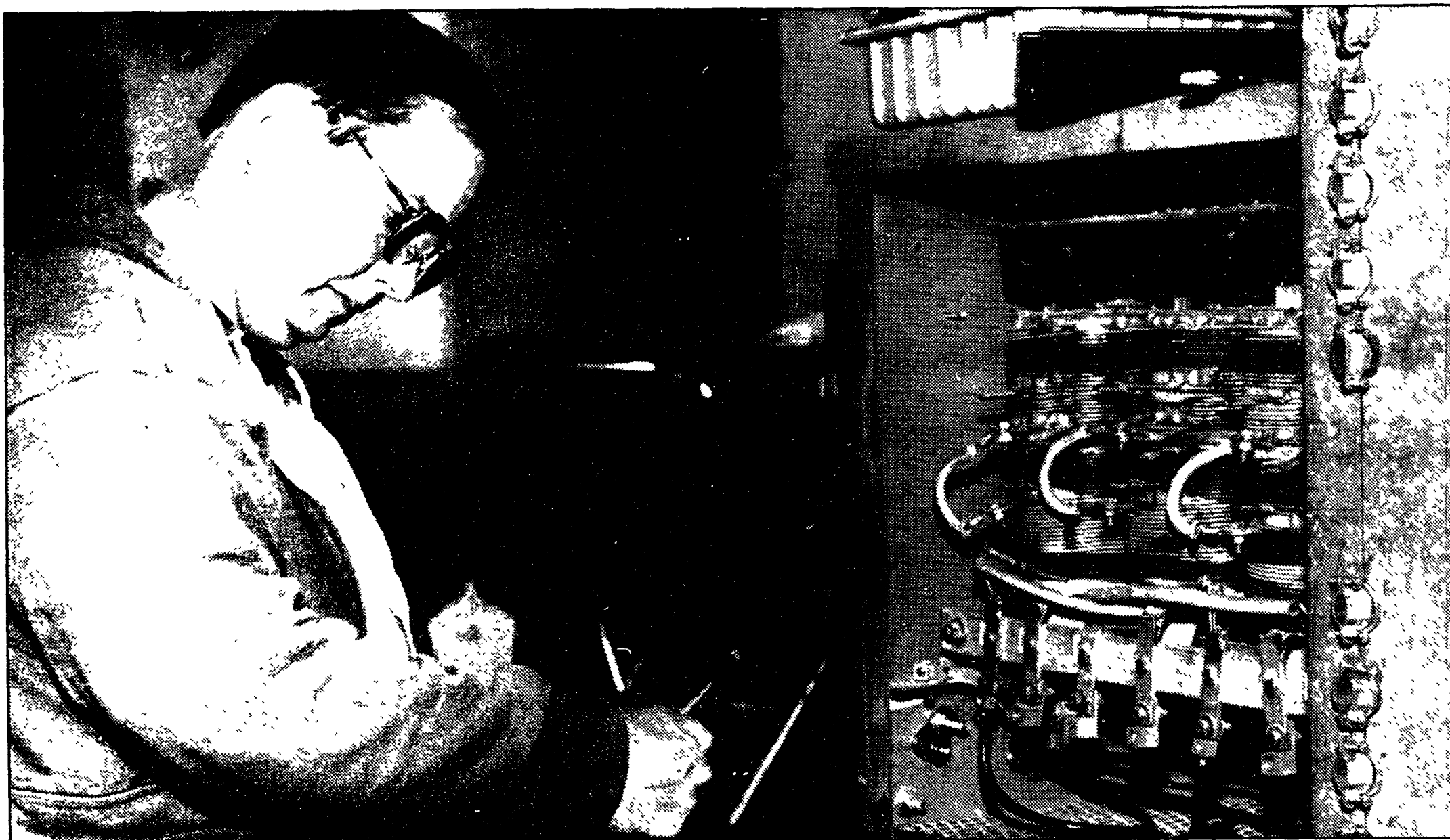
He said proprietors will see an in-

crease in business and will probably have to hire more workers.

Bowman said the Expo Center is beneficial because it will fill the hotels.

"It promotes and provides for a tremendous amount of additional business activity, which this community can greatly afford and use right now," he said.

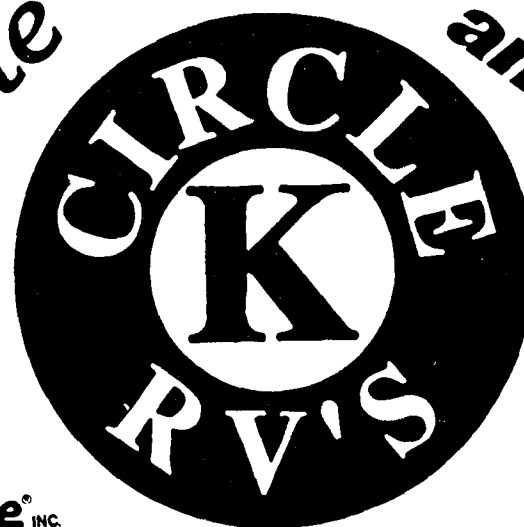

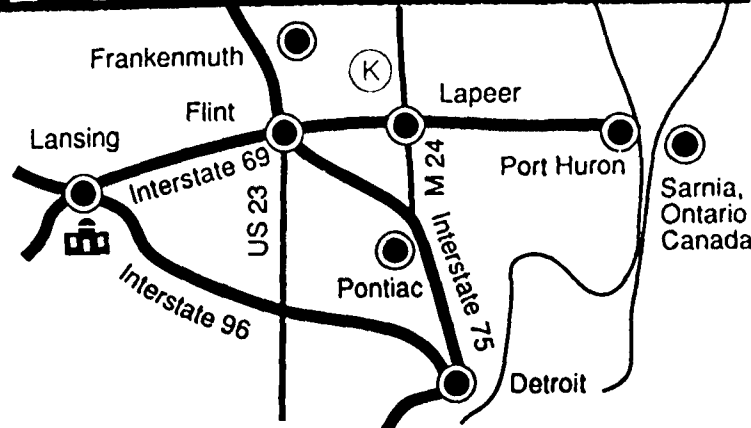

# RV growth led to MARVAC formation

As the popularity of camping and recreational vehicles has increased, a demand developed for an organization to coordinate efforts and represent the industry's interests. Thus, The Michigan Association of Recreational Vehicles and Campgrounds (MARVAC) was born.

MARVAC represents member dealers, campgrounds, manufacturers, suppliers and service companies throughout the state.

With nearly \$300 million in sales annually, the RV industry has weathered difficult economic

times and, through the efforts of MARVAC, continues to create new demand.

MARVAC hosts six camper and RV shows across the state annually and publishes *RV and Campsites*, a comprehensive directory of state and private campgrounds in the state. The directory is offered at no charge.

The association also helps RV-related business by promoting RVs and campgrounds through the media and by providing educational presentations to the public. MARVAC also help businesses just starting out by running workshops and repair workshops.

More importantly, MARVAC represents the RV

industry at the State Capitol. Lobbyists follow legislation related to the industry and work to sway legislators to their side of the issue.

Michigan follows only the hot-weather states of California and Florida in RV sales, indicating a need for a group to represent the industry.

"Class C motor home sales are up 22 percent in the first seven months (of 1992), travel trailers are up more than 23 percent, and fifth wheels (are up) 39 percent," said MARVAC director Ed Klim. "This is particularly significant because last year was a good year."

MARVAC is a division of Michigan Manufactured Housing, RV and Campground Association.
