Concerned Residents mark five years

Whatever you do, don't confuse them with those anti tax gadflies known as Citizens for a Better Northville.

The Concerned Residents of Northville have more members, a broader agenda and a longer history of civic involvement.

In fact, the group of 50 odd Northville City families is celebrating its fifth anniversary of exploring residents' concerns and representing them at city hall.

In its opening statement in the Sept. 24, 1987, issue of *The Northville Record*, the group listed its central concern as "a shared apprehension over the future of the residential districts of our city."

"The town is a hot property right now, a tempting target for developers and redevelopers," wrote founding

members Nancy Bohn, Carol Strauch, Dave Totten and Mark Cryderman then. "We have seen Birmingham and Southfield developed past the point we are comfortable with. If we replace single residences with condominiums, then replace the condominiums with high rises, we will do great things for the tax base — but in the process we will have destroyed the unique charm of Northville."

The organization still lists its chief goal as maintaining a healthy balance between residential and business land use in Northville. But in the past five years it has added other concerns to the list, including the dangers of the Eight Mile Road curve, the unsightly use of a Center Street residential lot for racetrack parking, slitting in the Lexington Pond and the potential relocation of the Northville Post Office. The Concerned Resi-

dents have also attempted to play matchmaker for that most difficult to arrange marriage between the Ford Valve Plant and the public library.

"All we are trying to be is a residents' organization in place in case there are what we consider unwise attempts to change the quality of life in Northville," Totten said. "It seems to me the community is better served by having organizations in place. In case something happens, they can react."

Among its achievements, Concerned Residents encouraged the city to set up the home maintenance ordinance adopted in 1988. Letters from the group to Detroit Edison and the state's public services commission spurred Detroit Edison to implement a local line-clearing program in 1989. And member Nancy Bohn helped set up volunteer staffing for the recycling center at the city's DPW

Yard, allowing it to maintain a two day schedule when city officials were considering cutting its hours.

While the group has not attained solutions to all its concerns, its members have been effective in exploring and obtaining information on the issues.

While it has become involved in several smaller skirmishes, Concerned Residents maintains its focus on the larger struggle of maintaining the city's quality of life, Totten said.

"You can take a small community, and with enough pressure from the developers, it could stop being a small community and become the hub of a minor megalopolis," he said. "We try to hold the line."

Concerned Residents of Northville will hold its next meeting at City Hall, 215 W. Main, at 8 p.m. this Wednesday, Oct. 28.

Meeting discusses three tax proposals

State treasurer Douglas Roberts made no guarantees at Wednesday night's Town Meeting that Proposal C would spur the new economic growth the state needs to fund the tax proposal.

Proposal C, known as Gov. John Engler's "Cut and Cap" plan, seeks economic growth to fund the prop-

osed tax-relief plan which calls for a 30-percent cut in school property taxes in the next five years, Roberts said he makes no promises that will happen.

"We may not get the growth," Roberts told the 75-person audience that attended the Northville PTA's Legislative Action Network Town Meeting last week. "I have no guarantees about that, but I am not proud of the (state's) economic history."

Roberts, who's been a state official for the past 20 years, said he's frustrated with Michigan's economy. Since 1966 he said he's seen the state's unemployment rates remain higher than national averages. The fact that taxpayers in Michigan pay higher property tax burdens than most residents in other states is also nothing to write home about, he said.

"The data is overwhelming that something is fundamentally wrong

with the economic condition of the state," he said. "For 25 consecutive years Michigan's unemployment rates have been above national averages. This is something that begs for discussion. Even in our best year we didn't even have a good or equivalent unemployment rate."

"We aren't growing or creating jobs," he said. "We have to do some-

Township set to pass budget after hearing

A five-member committee will unveil its proposal to slice more than a half-million dollars from the township budget at a budget adoption public hearing Wednesday.

It's anticipated that pricey capital outlay projects will bear the brunt of a budget review committee's cost reduction plan.

The committee also is expected to pitch ways the township can further cut costs and raise revenues in the face of a lingering, cash-sapping recession.

The Township Board will adopt its 1993 budget following the 7 p.m. public hearing.

Current and incoming township officials comprised this year's budget review team. The committee met on three occasions and hammered out a "tentatively balanced" budget of about \$3.7 million, said Dwayne Harrigan, township finance director.

Township revenues are anticipated to be about \$3.8 million in 1993. The review committee's proposal would combine those excess funds with a current fund balance of about \$146,500 to bring the township's savings account to about \$255,000.

Harrigan said budget reviewers

have completed formal meetings but were "still discussing things" as of Friday. Those things include researching options on capital outlay purchases such as a police dispatch radio and a fire department ambulance.

The township apparently is still considering whether to buy, lease, or exclude those two items — with a combined \$250,000 price tag — from the 1993 budget.

Highlights of the budget review committee's recommendations include:

- The township should explore new sources of revenue, such September's failed Truth-in-Taxation effort.
 - A review of community shared services programs — specifically library, senior citizen, and Northville Youth Assistance — should take place. The budget committee noted that austere budgets cloud the programs.
 - Consider a reduced work week to reduce labor expenses.
 - Investigate ways to reduce employee medical insurance premiums.
 - Evaluate employee educational reimbursement policy.
 - Review the management form of government used by the township.
- The budget public hearing and adoption will be held at township hall, 41600 Six Mile.

Meijer store plans to add security

The Meijer store at Eight Mile and Haggerty in Northville Township prides itself on offering shoppers 24 hour convenience and variety.

But the store's location and selection have long attracted a less desirable customer, the type of shopper who prowls the sprawling, crowded Meijer parking lot in search of a quick buck.

Some of the crimes committed there are petty: stolen hubcaps or scratched car doors. Other incidents are more serious: ranging from auto mobile larcenies and purse snatchings to assaults, indecent exposures and car thefts.

Indeed, two people have met violent deaths on Meijer grounds within the past 18 months. In April 1991, undercover police shot to death an alleged cocaine dealer in the Meijer lot. And a Meijer loss prevention officer was murdered just inside the store in August, when a 16 year old alleged shoplifter jammed a knife in the employee's heart.

Reeling from those and other acts of violence at some of its 70 Michigan and Ohio stores, Meijer officials now admit parking lot crime is a problem.

As a result, the Northville store will be the fourth state site to receive an infusion of security measures meant to provide better protection — and peace of mind — for the Grand Rapids based store's customers.

In the next few weeks, Meijer will install security cameras to scan the parking lot and alert employees and customers of crime and potential danger. It will equip its cart collectors

and baggers — those who spend considerable time in the parking lot — with pager like devices that can signal for help when the employee witnesses trouble.

And Meijer will install additional lighting to cut shadows from some of the hidden corners of the lot. The changes are popping up because Meijer wants its customers to feel safe, said Jack McCarthy, vice-president of loss prevention for Meijer.

"We're concerned about what's taking place in the parking lots," McCarthy said Thursday. "I think we're going to focus on parking lots more than in the past."

Northville is not the only site to suffer from serious crime, nor is it the first to witness beefed up security. An abduction and rape from a Kalamazoo store prompted similar security moves at two Kalamazoo sites and one store in Battle Creek, said McCarthy, who said Northville ranked "slightly above average" in chain-wide crime statistics.

Township police are frequent visitors to the Meijer store. Complaints registered by Meijer shoppers or employees fill page after page of police reports. The vast majority of vehicles reported stolen in the township — 24 stolen and three unsuccessful attempts in 1992 — disappeared from the Meijer lot.

Police Chief Chip Snider welcomed word of an increased security commitment.

"I think through Jack McCarthy, Meijer is taking every effort they can to

thing to change that or our children — my children — will have to get a job outside of the state."

Roberts, in favor of Proposal C, was one of three panelists who participated in the meeting at Northville High School. He was joined by Scott Schrager, senior committee analyst of the House Taxation Committee, an advocate of Proposal A (HJR-H); and David Olmstead, who presented the latest version of the Olmstead/Kearney principals. The O/K proposal is the only proposal discussed Wednesday that is not on the Nov. 3 general election ballot.

Roberts talked mostly about the need to jump-start the state's economy by reducing taxes. He said he believes Michigan would see economic growth if tax levies were reduced for residents and for businesses.

"Our No. 1 problem is the fact that we have high property taxes. That discourages development," he said. That is why Roberts said he believes in Proposal C. Under the tax-relief plan, school property taxes would be reduced by 30 percent over the next five years. In addition, Proposal C seeks to cap property assessments at 3 percent or at the rate of inflation, whichever is lower. If voters pass Cut and Cap and it becomes a constitutional amendment, the state would have to reimburse the 30-percent property tax cut to the schools.

That proposal differs from the HJR-H proposal (Proposal A), which seeks to limit property tax assessments to 5 percent a year or to the rate of inflation, whichever is less — but only for homes. It includes no outright tax cut.

As a spokesperson for Proposal A, Schrager agreed with Roberts about the state's economy, but said A approaches the problem by limiting property assessments rather than cutting taxes.

"We are facing difficult times in Michigan. For the past two years the state has ended its fiscal year in a deficit," Schrager said.

"A is really a choice," Schrager said. "And it's a choice you might choose to make rather than (Proposal C). A controls assessments with out the disadvantages of C."

Schrager said the biggest disadvantage of C is that in order to fund it and reimburse tax cuts to schools, there will have to be budget cuts in other state programs including potential further cuts to education.

"A is a better proposal than C," Schrager said. "I just hope that voters

use their best judgment and make the best decision for themselves as homeowners. A is better for homeowners, and it doesn't present the jeopardy to state programs that C does."

In contrast to Roberts, Schrager said he believes the number one problem in the state is rising assessments for homeowners. That's why he backs the HJR-H proposal, which puts a cap on assessments without making any cuts.

Since Cut and Cap affects school finance and may bring new "Robin Hood" funding schemes, Schrager said A might be the better choice for Northville taxpayers who have been adversely affected by tax-base sharing.

"C affects school finance, and it locks into the constitution subsidies from the state for wealthier districts."

While both A and C provide tax relief, the Olmstead/Kearney concept seeks to reform school finance, eliminate Robin Hood tactics, and calls for the state to make good on its earlier promise to fund public education with the lottery proceeds. In addition, its authors — Olmstead and Phillip Kearney — hope to provide tax relief by reducing millage rates and getting the state to return to funding 50 percent of public education as it did in the '70s.

"We are not going to be passive and wait for Lansing to act," Olmstead said.

As a co-author of the O/K principals, the member of the Detroit Board of Education said he has convinced others to adopt his attitude toward school finance reform and tax relief.

"Four years ago in the Detroit schools we were close to state receivership," he said. "Since then we've been able to turn around attitudes. We have also come into an agreement about Robin Hood acts."

"(Tax base sharing) has caused a greater disparity in per pupil expenses and in millage rates in some areas. . . . All we are saying to the state is keep your promises."

The three supporters spoke briefly about their proposals and then responded to written questions submitted by audience members.

mitted by audience members.

Many of the spectators' questions were directed to Roberts quizzing him about Cut and Cap and its impact on schools. Residents wanted to know how he and the state expected to fund the tax cut and reimburse the schools given its current deficit.

"The schools can go ask for money in millages. The only difference is now (under Cut and Cap) they have to ask for it," Roberts said.

Roberts reiterated his point that Michigan needs to revive its business base by cutting taxes. He said C would be the catalyst spurring that economic growth.

Olmstead called C "a dishonest, destructive type of tax cut" that makes no provision for cutting tax rates. Schrager said it would prove destructive to the state's schools, like a similar effort in California.

Roberts disagreed. "Look at California. In 1980 Michigan lost two Congressional seats. California gained seven. People went to California and jobs were created," he said.

At the conclusion of the discussion

all three panelists complimented LAN for the quality and content of the debate. Each said they had participated in other debates but found this one to be informative and well coordinated.

"This has been one of the best debates yet," Schrager said. "The questions were challenging and covered a wide variety of subjects."

ensure their store is safe for the Northville community," Snider said.

McCarthy said the store is owning up to problems in its parking lots in part because of adverse publicity in newspapers and other media. He said the new security measures are "consumer motivated."

Three or four cameras will be mounted near the Northville Meijer entrances within the next three to five weeks, McCarthy said. The cameras will scan the parking lot and store staffers will constantly watch color monitors to detect problems. Customers can look at the monitors to check on their vehicles, and video

tapes of crimes may even be available to police for criminal prosecution, McCarthy said.

Meijer is experimenting with additional safety steps as well. Store owned and operated security vehicles will soon cruise three Michigan store parking lots, McCarthy said. Northville will not host a security vehicle for now, but could in the future, after Meijer determines the effectiveness of patrols.

McCarthy sees the new security items as a good will gesture toward Northville and its shoppers. "We're a community member, and we're going to be here for a long time," he said.

Bullard, Havey face off for seat

Democratic hopeful Robert Havey is seeking to unseat incumbent Rep. Willis Bullard, R-Milford, in the new 38th District of the State House of Representatives.

Bullard has served in the current 60th House District since 1983 representing the Oakland County part of Northville, Novi, and much of the western part of the county. He moved from his home in Highland to run for a seat in the new district.

Havey has been involved in local government in the City of Wixom, where he lives.

The new 38th District includes the Oakland County part of Northville as well as Novi, Wixom, South Lyon, Lyon and Milford townships, and Milford Village.

The two recently gathered for a joint interview at this newspaper's request. A third candidate, Libertarian Mark Elscholz, did not attend.

What qualifies you for the office?

HAVEY: My background is with the Service Employees International Union working on the executive board. I see problems every day you would think can't be resolved and we've been able to resolve them.

I think the voters out there want someone who can get problems solved and that would be my goal. I'm a

great believer in putting aside labels, Democrat or Republican. Let's get to the issues, let's find resolutions and let's find what works for everybody in the state.

BULLARD: I feel my background, four years in local government, 10 years as state representative, is the best to continue on the job for another two years. I feel I have a record of accomplishment and my voting record is in keeping with what a majority of people in this area want their representatives to vote for or against.

One of the amendments I authored last year eliminated 18,000 small businesses in Michigan from having to file a single business tax return, saving those businesses \$10 million a year plus whatever it cost to prepare the SBT return, which might be another \$10 million in tax preparation fees.

Just a comment about Mr. Havey's comment about [party affiliations] — it does make a difference. The Democrats now have control, Republicans have a minority. We're hoping to change that in this election — but if you look at the voting records of so-called conservative Democrats in Lansing, they vote they are not so conservative.

HAVEY: I would just like to add that I have been involved in city government. I've been a commissioner

on parks and recreation for the City of Wixom, and after serving there for a period of three years I chaired a Quality of Life committee for strategic planning. So I have been out there and have talked to the people in the community and I think I know what they want.

I understand that one of the issues you disagree on is the Cut and Cap proposal. Mr. Havey, why are you against the proposal?

HAVEY: The No. 1 reason I am against the proposal is, it's going to end up taking \$2 billion from education and right now there's no place to replace that money. To me, education is the No. 1 priority, the thread that goes through all the other issues. You talk about jobs, they talk about education so you can have qualified people for the jobs. You talk about drug abuse, they talk about education. It is in every other one of the issues that is out there and that would be my top priority.

Team 11 is a bipartisan effort to find an alternative funding to education as opposed to just property tax, and I'm all for that. I think we need the quality education and I cannot allow that money to go out of

education.
BULLARD: I strongly support Proposal C. I think we have to look at our property tax payers who are taxed beyond all reasonable limits. We have one of the highest property taxes in the whole country, either third highest or fifth highest depending on which national survey you look at.

The question about \$2 billion, yes, it will be a \$2-billion statewide cut in property taxes but at the end of five years. This is a responsible proposal because the cut will be gradual over the five years. It will be 10 percent in school operating funds the first year, then 5 percent each additional year until at the end of the five years you have the 30 percent cut.

The proposal also is a constitutional amendment. The Legislature is mandated to return to the schools that \$2 billion, dollar for dollar. And since it's in the constitution I have no doubt that that will be done.

I know local schools here have borne the brunt of some of the recent proposals that have passed that I opposed; first the tax base sharing,

Fire Safety

Preparation can help prevent chimney fires

There was a nip in the air of the sort that had not been felt for many months.

The leaves were displaying the height of their fall colors, and folks had dug into the back of closets to pull out sweaters and jackets thankfully stored away the previous spring. The odor of wood smoke was noticeable in the neighborhood as well, as fireplaces and wood stoves were put to use providing warmth and comfort to residents. Change was in the air, and the local firefighters knew fall had finally arrived when the alarm tone announced the first chimney fire of the season.

The citizens who inhabited Northville a hundred years ago, when wood and coal were the principal forms of heating fuel, knew the dangers presented by chimney fires. As modern technology has brought high-efficiency gas and

fuel oil furnaces, most have forgotten the importance of the job performed by the chimney sweep. Those of us who continue to enjoy the occasional glow of a fire in the fireplace or wood-burning stove, however, cannot afford to forget the necessity of keeping our flues and chimneys clean.

The most common cause of chimney fires is the buildup of creosote and other hydrocarbon residues on the inside linings of chimneys. As wood burns, these flammable resins coat the inside of our chimneys. If the coating is allowed to build up sufficiently, heat, sparks and burning embers traveling up the chimney can ignite the residue, causing chimney fires.

So long as the fire remains confined to the chimney, the fire may do little more than cause an inconvenience and a mess. Because many chimneys run through or alongside walls and siding, however, the heat produced by a chimney fire can all too easily spread to other parts of

the house.

Chimney fires can also be caused by improperly venting multiple heating sources into a single flue. For example, venting a gas-fired furnace and a wood-burning fireplace into the same chimney flue can result in burning embers from the fireplace igniting incompletely burned gas venting through the chimney. The key is to avoid mixing different fuels in the same flue. Use separate flues in the same chimney or separate chimneys, if different flues are being used for different purposes.

A simple problem that can be easily avoided is making sure the flue damper on your fireplace or wood stove is open before starting a fire. A closed damper will not, typically, result in a fire. It will, however, cause your house to fill with smoke and require you to spend several hours cleaning up the soot and smoke stains left behind.

As firefighters arrived at the scene flames could be seen pouring from the top of the chimney. A ladder was quickly raised and the fire attacked with dry chemical ex-

tinguishers. This was successful in knocking back the flames, but the fire continued to burn deep in the chimney shaft. A special nozzle was attached to a length of hose and lowered into the chimney. A low-volume, high-pressure water mist sprayed from the nozzle in all directions, cooling and extinguishing the fire with a minimum of water. Firefighters inside the house placed salvage covers around the hearth to further limit water damage. In a few minutes, the fire was out.

Fortunately, this fire had not extended into the walls of the house, and damage was held to a minimum. As firefighters picked up their equipment, the chief reminded the homeowners that frequent use of a fireplace or wood burning stove called for yearly cleaning of the chimney. It was advice the relieved homeowner would not soon forget.

then the recapture . . .

I don't think the out-of-formula districts will be in any worse position if Cut and Cap passes than they are now. They're vulnerable now. They're subject to the annual appropriations process, and there's no way, subject to maybe a further constitutional amendment, that that's going to change.

HAVEY: I would like to say I agree with him that the Robin Hood theory, this taking from one district and giving it to another, is not going to work. I think it's pitting one community against another. It's not a positive thing. We've got to bring people back together . . .

BULLARD: If cut and cap does not pass I think we are going to be in a terrible situation of getting, in this area, double-digit assessment increases because the Legislature put a freeze on for last year . . .

Do you support any particular actions or have any suggestions for improving the quality of education?

BULLARD: We have enacted a number of laws in recent years, school improvement programs and student portfolios, all sorts of things. Core curriculum. I supported all those proposals, I think they're good but we've given the local schools a lot of changes to adjust to. I think we need a moratorium or breathing space.

If somebody comes along with some great idea to improve the quality of education I'm going to support it but I think we've done a lot of things to improve the quality of schools in the last couple of years. I think the best way you can have quality education is to hire a good teacher and put him or her in a classroom with students who want to learn.

I think the state has a limited ability to improve education. I think the local school boards have the responsibility to hire a good staff, motivate students, and I think in that way you'll have quality education.

HAVEY: I recently read a blue ribbon committee report that examined education and came back with suggestions. Some of those suggestions I wholeheartedly agree with.

To get the business community involved with the schools, addressing where the jobs are going to be. Let the

educators know what fields (the jobs) are going to be in and what is required of those students when they graduate.

The businesses can say, look, we've got these jobs here. They've got to be strong in math, they've got to be strong in this area, they've got to be strong in that area.

In an idea of cooperation, I would like to see it where they can have job training programs where the students can actually go out and work in these jobs. Example, travel agency—the student can come to the travel agency and see where these skills are needed. You've got to know geography, you've got to be able to communicate on the phone, you've got to be able to work the terminal to put the bookings in . . .

What can be done to reduce crime and make our communities safer?

HAVEY: The state can work with communities to make moneys available to certain targeted areas that are having difficulty. I think we can work with the communities to solve these types of problems.

To me, again, it is a core problem to the education that is so critically important. With that, and with the creation of jobs, we would not be experiencing the type of crime levels we are experiencing.

I cannot see why we've got to spend \$20,000 a year on an individual (in prison). And one question I would like to ask Mr. Bullard is, there was a bill being considered that, when someone was convicted, that the amount it would cost to incarcerate him, on a yearly basis, would be revealed.

He opposed that bill and I don't understand. I think it should be public knowledge and people should be aware of what it is costing them to keep (convicts) in prison.

The fact is that the prisons aren't rehabilitating. If anything, it is teaching them to commit other crimes. That's a system that we have to take a long hard look at.

BULLARD: On that last point, I'm not sure what bill he's talking about, but no doubt it was a minor part of the bill and there were other things that I objected to so I voted against it.

On the general issue of crime, I think it's generally acknowledged or conceded that at least half of our murders are drug-related and drugs

also result in a lot of breaking and enterings and armed robberies and other violent crimes.

One of the ways we can get at drug conspirators is through giving wiretap authority to the state police. The Senate has passed that bill a number of times and it's always been bottled up in the House because the liberal Democrats, through Perry Bullard, chair of the Judiciary Committee, don't like wiretapping in any form.

There are some other things that can be done. One minor thing that I was interested in recently was a bill in the Senate to eliminate the automatic right of appeal when you enter a guilty plea . . .

Where do you stand on the abortion issue?

HAVEY: I'm pro-choice and I believe it's a right to privacy issue. I agree with Barbara Bush: I don't think it has any place in politics. It's a right of privacy and it's a very personal, tough decision for someone to make. It doesn't mean I support abortion, but I do think it's a privacy issue and it should be taken out of our arena.

BULLARD: In my years in the state Legislature I've voted on three abortion-related issues. The first vote I cast was to eliminate or ban Medicaid-funded abortions because I don't feel government should be involved in the abortion decision either to encourage it or discourage it, and I don't think the taxpayers want to pay for abortions. That was on the ballot and 50 percent statewide reaffirmed that we should not pay for Medicaid abortions.

The second issue I faced was parental consent. I voted in favor of parental consent because I think a minor under 18 is still a minor and should have either parental consent or go to the probate court to make sure that decision is made intelligently with good forethought so there aren't any regrets later in life . . .

The third issue I faced as a legislator is the informed consent issue, and there were a lot of little issues but it boiled down to two main issues. I voted for the pro-choice version of the bill . . .

Where do you stand on insurance reform, Proposal D?

HAVEY: I supported the Senate bill that was passed that Gov. Engler vetoed, SB 691, that was the insur-

ance reform act. It had the built-in decreases that you would receive initially under the AAA proposal, Proposal D, but it also had built-in constitutional protections.

When increases were to be sought, there would be a commission that would oversee these raises. The AAA bill, let's put it this way—you have a private company that going out and spending \$14 million to 16 million. Now I've heard as a result, if this bill is passed, they will receive about \$10 million, \$11 million a year, and that will be forever. When a company comes across with that kind of a thing you've got to scrutinize the bill very carefully.

Yes, it would decrease the premiums for a short period of time but I would say you'd see an increase later

on and the bill that Gov. Engler, for whatever reason, vetoed.

BULLARD: I've taken the position that I'm going to reluctantly support D. I will vote yes. That's probably, of all the propositions, the most difficult one for me because if you look at D there are some good things and some bad.

I'm voting for it because it is a 20 percent average cut in auto insurance premiums and I think that's what people want. The price that has to be paid for reduced premiums is to limit the medical benefits and the no fault policy to \$250,000.

That's going to take care of 99 percent of accidents, but there's going to be a small portion of people that will come up against that cap and there won't be any more money. They're go-

ing to have to go against their health insurance policies or public systems such as Medicare or Medicaid.

At \$250,000, I've agonized over this part of it, you can say it should be unlimited but I don't think we can afford unlimited medical benefits. And only one other state has \$250,000 in their no fault law, most other states have less, like \$50,000.

The other reason that I reluctantly decided to vote for D is that the professor at University of Virginia Law School who wrote the first no fault law in the country, and then co-wrote Michigan's law, has come out in favor of Proposal D and he is the foremost expert on it. He thinks that voting for Proposal D is in keeping with the spirit of the original law that he co-wrote.



Solid candidates make trustee picks difficult

Northville Township residents already know the identities of their next supervisor, clerk, and treasurer. Those offices were filled by landslide proportions during the Aug. 4 Republican primary.

Voters will round out the seven-member Township Board Nov. 3, filling four trustee vacancies from a field of four Republicans and one Democrat.

We're excited about this new board, and think voters have a handful of good choices for the trustee slots. But only the top four vote-getters will get the nod.


There are no cut-and-dried reasons to exclude any of the trustee candidates from this general election field. All five are capable individuals who could lend varying degrees of expertise to the somewhat frightening task at hand. We think any combination of the five hopefuls will upgrade the board from its current status.

The township is faced with a number of real problems, including ever-troubling budgetary constraints; the possible/probable selection of new professional consultants; pressure for heightened shared-services programs; and perhaps the most important issue, an in-depth review of the Western Townships Utilities Authority and the township's financial commitment to that multi-million-dollar sewer project.

Clearly, the township needs a board that will roll up its sleeves and do the dirty work, not delegate that authority to its consultants — a major failing of the ousted board. We think the following trustee candidates are best able to provide the leadership to tackle the aforementioned difficulties.

MARK ABBO walked away from the Aug. 4 primary with the lion's share of the trustee votes. There's good reason for that. Abbo has shown a willingness to look beyond the simple declarations of the current board and its consultants. As a CPA, he is well-qualified to sift through all the numbers associated with the WTUA program. We think Abbo will be an excellent addition to the new board.

JAMES PETRIE is the sole Democrat running for a board seat and could make township history by placing among the top four vote-getters. He should be a shoo-in. Petrie was a standout at the township candidates' forum in July, and carries with him a wealth of government

experience from his days on both the Northville Board of Education and the Wayne County Board of Education. Petrie's abilities and reputation should allow him to easily overcome knee-jerk anti-Democrat sentiments. Township voters would be wise to elect him.

RUSS FOGG is another strong choice. Fogg takes an everyperson approach to township duties and has served as a member of the tax Board of Appeals and on the Planning Commission. He's smart, capable, and dedicated. He seemingly has a lot of questions he'd like answered, and those questions echo the thoughts of many township residents.

We also recommend **GINI BRITTON** for a seat on the new board. Britton seems representative of the new breed of township resident, those who have moved into the community during the past 5-10 years and don't understand — and frankly couldn't care less about — the sniping and petty politics that have doomed increased commitments to shared services programs. She wants to put a halt to costly, duplicated city and township services, and we couldn't agree more.

We've excluded Barbara O'Brien from our endorsement list, but would not argue against her election. Like the other trustee candidates, O'Brien has been a frequent attendee at board meetings and other township events. She most definitely will make her voice heard, but we wonder about her ability to compromise and stray from her personal agenda. Township officials have in the past wronged O'Brien, but her tormentors were snuffed out in the August primary. Regardless of the Nov. 3 results, O'Brien already has made an impact on the future of the township.

Voters will be hard-pressed to make a mistake with this crop of trustee candidates, but by electing Abbo, Petrie, Fogg, and Britton, we think the township's future will brighten considerably.

McCotter for Wayne

Northville voters next Tuesday will elect representatives to both the Wayne and Oakland county commissions. South of Baseline Road, Republican Thaddeus McCotter faces off against Democrat Michael Caffery, and **THADDEUS MCCOTTER** provides the only real option.

The upstart McCotter accomplished the feat of winning a four-way primary race over a very well-known incumbent and one higher-profile challenger. In so doing, he showed himself to be informed, committed, and opposed to the back-room back-patting style of government which outgoing incumbent Maurice Breen practiced so well.

He'd take the appropriate and somewhat unusual step of making the commission his full-time job (Breen's predecessor, Susie Heintz, did the same thing, but most on the commission don't). He has experience on an elected

body — the Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees — but is about the furthest thing possible from an arrogant incumbent politician.

We'd take issue with McCotter on one or two points; for example, we do think urban sprawl is a far more serious concern than he seemed to indicate in his interview with this paper. On the whole, though, Northville can rest assured McCotter will do right by them on the commission.

It's hard to take Caffery at all seriously. He has admitted knowing next to nothing about the county ballot proposals. And after skipping three interview appointments with the paper — never calling ahead of time — he asked whether advertising with us would, quite literally, buy him another chance.

It wouldn't, and we'd hate to see that attitude sent down to the county building. McCotter should win in a landslide.

Schmid for Oakland

Echoing the situation in Wayne County, the Oakland County Commission race for the seat that includes northern Northville lacks any real choice.

Incumbent KAY SCHMID could be rightly criticized by Northville voters, but provides the only credible option. Her Democratic opponent, William Brinker, does not appear to be running a serious campaign. He did not elect to participate in our pre-election interviews.

At the same time, Schmid has worked hard at her job. She's been successful at gaining clout within the county board itself. She's on powerful committees there,

like the planning and building committee and general government committee. She has managed to win appointment to the post of vice-chair of the Republican caucus. And she's been on top of the regional development initiatives through the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments.

As to the criticism: Her profile and presence in Northville has been nowhere near what it's been in Novi, which, to be fair, is her hometown.

That's not enough reason to turn her out for an unknown and apparently half-hearted candidate, though. Return Schmid to the board.

Privacy is a complex matter



About six months ago I was alone in the office when a call came over our police scanner.

Northville Township rescue units were responding to a car accident involving injuries at Six Mile and Haggerty. Since no one else was around, I grabbed a camera and headed for the location.

The scene was already clogged with police cars, ambulances, tow trucks and fire and rescue vehicles, lights ablaze in the dusk. Rush hour traffic exacerbated what was already a very busy-looking scene. In the middle were the two vehicles, a Lincoln and an Escort which had hit almost head-on.

I started shooting with the camera almost the minute I got out of my car. As the camera clicked and I toyed with the lighting, I became very focused on what was happening in the viewfinder. Like a bird dog in a point, I was unaware of anything else going on around me.

As I photographed firefighters tending to the driver of the Escort, I felt a hand on my shoulder. It shocked me out of my trance and made me jump. It was a firefighter, and a pretty young one at that.

"Hey, you're not supposed to take pictures of those people," he said.

Still a little dazed, I said, "Oh, okay."

But then as the firefighter turned away, my thoughts cleared. No, he's wrong. I thought. I can take pictures of this accident and the victims. As long as the accident occurred on a public road and not on someone's private property, I'm entitled to shoot away.

And so I did.

I was reminded of that incident Thursday when I attended a journalism conference at Central Michigan University. A panel discussion turned to issues of invasion of privacy, among other things.

Reporters raised questions about incidents similar to mine, and the panel answered them honestly. On privacy — and other matters, too — the panel agreed that newspapers don't often do a good job of explaining to their readers how they work, and why they do what they do.

Now's my chance to give you a cursory knowledge of privacy as it relates to what we do here at the paper.

First let me point out that invasion of privacy is not a crime. A police officer can't throw you in jail for it. The police can only take action unless if are physically trespassing on private property, or you can show that you've been harassed or intimidated.

If you think your privacy has been invaded by a journalist or photographer — or anyone else for that matter — you and your lawyer have to take them to court yourselves.

What you consider privacy and the law considers privacy are probably two quite different things. And for better or worse, the law gives journalists and photojournalists a lot of latitude on what constitutes an invasion of privacy. Fortunately, the law is fairly specific on what does constitute such an invasion.

In my example of the accident, the law gives me the right to gather the news, no matter how horrific, as long as I don't cross onto private property to do it. Further, the law also says that the people in the photographs would have to show a loss of status in their community, or perhaps loss of wages or work, to prove that I had invaded their privacy.

I'll continue with more on this important matter in this space next week.

'Parent to Parent' series returns with programs

In years past, the Community Commission on Drug Abuse (CCODA) has presented informal "Parent to Parent" workshops that teach parents critical skills to prevent drug and alcohol abuse in their children.

This year's three-part workshop hosted by the Northville Counseling Center takes a more formalized and focused approach that seeks to build parenting skills in an effort to build prevention.

Jacque Martin-Downs from the Northville Counseling Center is a facilitator working on the series. She said the series, which begins this Thursday at 7 p.m. in room 132B in the high school, will train parents to

be parents.

"It's parenting for prevention, and it's a tremendous program," she said.

There are three components — awareness, prevention and intervention — that will be presented in four sessions.

Topics included in the Awareness component include "The Me Within," "Putting Yourself in the Way," "Awareness is your Best Friend" and "Remember the Difference." In the prevention component participants will hear seminars entitled "Expect and Inspect," "Never Cry Alone" and "Take Time for Yourself." "When All Else Fails" headlines the intervention component.

"It trains parents in preventing, diagnosing, and intervening in inappropriate child behaviors," Downs said.

The program includes video tapes and was written by noted "Parent to Parent" founder Bill Oliver. Downs quoted Oliver's comments about the program.

"What he says is that we are not failing to educate our children but rather failing to train their parents," she paraphrased.

The series is offered free of charge to parents. Each session is an hour long. There are four sections of Session A being offered on Thursday, Oct. 29 at 7-8:30 p.m.; and Nov. 5, 12 and 19. Session B starts Nov. 3 at 9-10:30 a.m., continuing Nov. 10, 17, and 14; and Session C kicks off Tuesday, Dec. 1 from 7-8:30 p.m. and runs on Dec. 8, 15, and Jan. 5.

The series is sponsored by CCODA and its funding arm, Southeastern Michigan Substance Abuse Services.

Advocates group to begin taping some board meetings

Residents wanting to see what's going on in the schools and at the Board of Education meetings are encouraged to tune in tonight.

Starting with tonight's regular board meeting, Advocates for Quality Education will begin filming board meetings at the various building locations for viewers who can't or choose not to attend the meetings.

It's just another effort Advocates is taking to keep an eye on district officials and try to get information out to the community.

Advocates member Jan Purtell is leading the amateur film crew into the deal with both Omnicom and Metrovision.

Purtell says filming the meetings will give residents the full picture of

what's going in the schools.

"It's just one of the ways Advocates felt information could get to the public in its entirety," she said.

District officials say Purtell will tape only the board meetings scheduled at the school buildings, and not those at the board meeting room. The board varies its meeting location, and the meetings in school buildings usually feature presentations about the individual school in which the meeting takes place.

Advocates' efforts are appreciated by district officials who said they wanted to do the same for residents.



German wines break tradition of sweetness

In the mid 1980s, German wines lost their luster with many American wine drinkers when they discovered chardonnay. They considered German wines sweet and they wanted to drink dry.

Today, many chardonnays are produced "sweeter" than German wines labeled "dry." To encourage you to take a new look at German wines, we are discussing the wines of only one producer, Deinhard & Company. Founded at the end of the 18th century by Johann Friedrich Deinhard, the firm is one of the largest and universally respected private estate owners.

Holdings total more than 250 acres in the most prestigious vineyards of the Rhine and Mosel. Among these are the largest shares of the famed Bernkasteler Doctor and Wehlener Sonnenuhr vineyards, as well as parcels in more than 40 other outstanding sites.

White wine grapes account for 88 percent of German wine production. About 20 percent of the grapes are the noble riesling, Germany's second most-planted grape variety after Muller-Thurgau, a lesser varietal. Riesling produces wines that are crisp with fruity acidity and have an almost indefinite aging capacity.

German wines are significantly lower in alcohol than chardonnay and their finesse and breed harmonize them easily to a broad spectrum of lighter foods such as seafoods, cold meats, poultry, veal and pork. They are especially flavorful with stir-fried vegetables and roast turkey.

Germany's Mosel and Rhine winegrowing regions experienced a trilogy of exceptional vintages in 1988, 1989 and 1990. These wines are available and represent good values.

As Americans, we're into over-chilling our beverages. Before serving, remove a German wine from the refrigerator for at least 20 minutes. If served too cold, the wine will not immediately reveal its full bouquet, flavor or complexity.

Connoisseurs frequently refer to Deinhard wines as the first "chateaux" wines of Germany. Deinhard has a complete line of wines from a sparkler (referred to as sekt in German) through elegant, lush dessert bottlings.

Deinhard created its first sekt in 1833, when one of the partners married a member of a leading family of Champagne. The sparkler Lila Brut (pronounced Lee lah) for the German color violet is produced from 100 percent riesling grapes which give it breed and elegance. It sports a generous, fresh fruitiness and long lived effervescence. Slightly floral and spicy notes pair it well to hors d'oeuvres and at \$8.25, Lila Brut is bargain priced bubbly.

Perfect as an accompaniment to appetizers or fresh fruit is the delicate, apple blossom and floral 1989 Bereich Bernkastel Riesling Q.b.A. (\$6.25) from the Mosel-Saar Ruwer area. It's fresh, clean finish is a great starter wine.


Deinhard's 1990 Riesling Dry (\$7) is 100 percent riesling from the Rheinhessen. With only 11 percent alcohol, its fresh dough and baked apple aromas remind us of fall. Pair it with broiled whitefish or trout and enjoy its fruity crisp edge against the slightly caramelized character of broiled fish.

The 1990 Piesporter Riesling (\$9.50) is fuller bodied than the Riesling Dry. It showcases rich elements and a good finish. It will pair well with roast chicken, poached white fish with a cream sauce or crab legs.

CUT-AND-DRIED

Tomatoes turn trendy

Today we're going to pretend to be Sicilian grandmas, getting our larders ready for the winter to come. Or, if the idea makes you happier, we're trendy chefs, thinking up a menu to excite our socially exclusive and gusteriously discerning clientele.

Such is the curious mix of modern cuisine that Nonna and our hero-artist chef might both be thinking of dried tomatoes.

It's an old, old idea in Italy, a bit of native rusticity that has attained high-fashion status in this country. Something that you might find in a traditional household over there ends up in a trendy kitchen here as seeming opposites meet in a kind of culinary Hegelianism.

The link may be the crass matter of price. Many a traditional product originally developed by a peasant culture as a way of tiding people through the winter has become startlingly expensive in the modern market economy.

Thus a jar of sun-dried tomatoes, packed in olive oil like Nonna used to make, can set you back \$5 to \$12 per 8 ounces, and what's costly stands a good chance of being fashionable.

Of course, it helps that Italian cooking reigns supreme today, encouraging importers to introduce us to once-rare products. And we shouldn't overlook the obvious fact that dried tomatoes — at least the kind preserved in olive oil — really do taste good: an intense tomato flavor, augmented by the richness of the oil, a quintessentially Italian taste raised to another order of magnitude.

Dried tomatoes today can be found in two varieties: the kind in oil and the completely desiccated (and much cheaper) type packed in plastic bags. The former have the superior flavor and can be used right out of the jar; the latter need some rehydrating and tend to have a harsh flavor.

For most people, the cost of the oil-packed tomatoes limits their use to the occasional luxury category. But you can

make your own, allowing you to use them with the profligacy of the trendy chef. Drying is mainly a matter of time.

First, though, you have to play the Nonna, preparing the tomatoes and arranging them for them to dry.

Nonna would use the sun to dry her tomatoes, and to this day, travelers in Sicily in August will see red fruit set out in racks on roofs or on strings hanging under eaves.

Here we recommend use of a home dehydrator (available at health-food and some specialty houseware shops), a convection oven or a standard oven. The main proviso for those who would use an oven is that it have a temperature control that can be set to 200 F or less; most modern types qualify.

Otherwise, the main ingredient in this recipe is patience — lots of it. Drying a batch of tomatoes will take all day, perhaps longer. The main work is concentrated in preparing the tomatoes initially, a matter of a few minutes, and at the end, when you have to keep an eye on the tomatoes and remove those that are ready ahead of others.

You will be astonished at how much the tomatoes shrink in this process. Recently I started out with five pounds and ended up with enough to fill a quart jar. This, of course, is the whole idea: You are also concentrating flavor, and that's what gives the oil-packed tomatoes their special quality. Because of the reduction in volume, drying is a good way of dealing with an excess of home-grown fruit.

PRELIMINARY CONSIDERATIONS

Equipment: I use a counter-top convection oven with two 12x18-inch racks; together, these hold about five pounds of tomatoes. The tomatoes go directly onto the racks. In a standard oven, the grid is too wide to allow this — because they dry and shrink, the tomatoes may fall

through. You will have to add something to prevent this, for example, some clean, wide-mesh screening.

Tomatoes: This recipe calls for the pear-shaped Roma tomatoes, now widely available. The more unusual yellow type add variety and work just as well. Try to select small fruit (which dry faster), all of the same size so that they will be finished more or less together.

Although I have never tried them, you might also use cherry tomatoes, which should dry fairly rapidly. I understand that you can use regular tomatoes cut in slices 1/4-inch thick, but I can't vouch for this from personal experience.

Ripeness: The tomatoes you choose for drying should be thoroughly ripe.

Timing: The drying process takes many hours — 12 in the case of the last batch I made. Once drying starts, it needs only the most cursory attention, but you have to be active at the end, taking out the tomatoes as they reach the right stage.

No matter how carefully I select fruit of a like size, they never get done all at once. I generally start a batch around 8 a.m., which means that the process should be completed before too late at night.

Quantity: Because a large quantity takes about the same work and exactly the same time as a little, you may as well make as many as possible. This will depend on how many drying racks your apparatus will hold.

As noted, my convection oven can hold about 5 pounds worth, and so the recipe has been set up for that amount.

HOME DRIED TOMATOES

5 pounds Roma tomatoes, preferably small and of uniform size

Salt
1 1-quart canning jar with a tight-fitting lid (we use the French type with a rubber gasket) or 2 1-pint jars, cleaned and dried

2 sprigs fresh rosemary or 1 teaspoon dried (optional)
About 2 cups olive oil (you may need more, depending on the size of your jar)

Yields 1 quart
If necessary, prepare racks to hold tomatoes. Do not use cookie sheets or containers; air must circulate all around tomatoes.

If using a standard oven, place flame-proof tray on bottom of oven to catch drips from tomatoes, or use aluminum foil for this purpose, making sure not to block vent holes.

Wash tomatoes; drain. Cut each tomato lengthwise almost but not quite in half. Spread tomato open, butterfly fashion. Cut each half almost in half again, spreading tomato open. Arrange tomatoes on racks, flesh side up. Sprinkle each tomato with little salt.

For a dehydrator: Follow manufacturer's instructions. In a dehydrator at 125 F, tomatoes will be ready in 16 to 24 hours.

In a convection oven: Place racks in oven; set temperature to 200 F, at which drying process will take perhaps 8 hours.

Recently, I tried using a lower temperature, but that lengthened the time greatly. Exchange rack positions once or twice during drying to help the tomatoes come out evenly.

In a regular oven: Place racks at different levels in oven; set temperature at 200 F. The process may take longer with a convection oven.

When done, tomatoes have shriveled and shrunk considerably. They no longer are juicy when prodded. During the drying process, I lightly press tomatoes from time to time to bring juice to the surface and, so I hope, hasten the drying. The tomatoes should not be completely desiccated and leathery; rather, they should have the consistency of dried fruit, such as prunes or apricots.

Sandwiches still staple for lunch crowd



Lots of new "foody" things are happening around here.

Finally, after a year, we have a lunch menu that is as creative and varied as the evening fare. This was no small feat, due to the noon-time clientele.

Time restrictions of one hour dictate that many items cannot be used. Never could we do a pot pie or beef Wellington. Instead, chicken strudel and beef stir-fry fill the bill.

When we first opened I had grandiose

ideas of gourmet luncheon fare at fair prices. Well, it could have worked if anyone else had wanted it. Full meals at lunch are not the norm. Salads, salads and more salads are. Add a cup of soup and voila... a satisfying meal.

And sandwiches. There is little that can compare, for me at least, to a great sandwich. Given two pieces of bread or a roll I can make a good meal with very little. Right now one of my kitchen favorites is a simple tomato, lettuce and onion number sprinkled with salt and pepper. Nice and filling. Also, very "clean."

As much as I may like this sandwich, I don't think that it would go well on a menu. Vegetarian items are still slow movers. So instead we've got a Philly steak sandwich. Lots of lean roast beef, grilled

onions and peppers, topped with melted provolone on a grilled onion roll.

Or, the ham, cheese and broccoli stromboli. Fresh bread dough wrapped around all of the above and baked until golden and oozy.

Interesting enough, self-enclosed sandwiches were invented for lunch boxes. The pasty is an example. Miners would wrap the just-from-the-oven pockets in newspaper and have a hot lunch hours later. A neat idea in my book.

And, finally, 365 days plus later I have relinquished to the "perceived" demand for a plain ol' turkey sandwich. Until today the turkey has been part of a California club. Basically, a club with guacamole in pita. It wasn't a best seller.

I'll bet that the turkey is. And I know

why. Just beautiful white meat that is roasted in our "own Little oven", served on white toast. Simple but satisfying. A "just-what-the-doctor-ordered" type of lunch.

It will be interesting to see just how popular turkey is. The latest nationwide poll states that tuna salad sandwiches are the No. 1 choice. Turkey follows. Not in this restaurant. Chicken salad with dried cranberries and walnuts is the favorite here.

Other happenings include the change over of summer to winter appetizers and desserts. Oysters Rockefeller and a Mediterranean plate of hummus, tabouleh and roasted garlic replaced the mussels and salmon cakes. A giant grilled cremini mushroom, a.k.a. a portabella, edged out stuffed shiitakes. And, gone is the chocolate shortcake in favor of tiramisu, the Italian dessert of lady fingers soaked with

brandy and espresso and layered with a delightfully light "cheese custard." One of my favorites.

Still to come, are the changes in the dinner entrees. You see, in my old age I've gotten smart. Changing menus means much more than cranking up the laser printer. Order sheets must be redone, prep lists revised, station set-up charts amended and recipes tested and corrected for use in a commercial kitchen. So, this time I'm making the transformation in stages.

My staff is much more involved in the developing of new items. Questionnaires were handed out for your input. The responses are enlightening and helpful. Still, there are hours upon hours involved in this transition. But it is well worth it. We get to hone our skills using new foods. You get to eat them

Tomatoes make for trendy fall

As tomatoes reach the proper stage, remove them to jar. Leave at least 1/4 inch headroom for the oil. When all tomatoes are in the jar, pour on olive oil; the tomatoes should be well covered. Run a thin knife around the inside of the jar to release any air bubbles. Add optional rosemary.

Storage: Today's tomatoes are lower in acid than those of former times, so it is no longer a good idea to store tomatoes in oil at room temperature; there might be a danger of food poisoning.

Instead, store the jar in the refrigerator at below 40 F. This may cause the oil to turn cloudy, but it will clear as soon as it warms a little. The tomatoes are ready to eat immediately but improve upon standing for a month or so. They will keep for several months.

Variations: You can use other herbs, such as basil, instead of or together with the rosemary. Some cooks like to add a clove or two of garlic, chopped.

Now that you've taken the time to dry a batch of tomatoes, what do you do with them? Here are some suggestions:

Pasta with Dried Tomatoes: For each portion of cooked pasta, allow 2 or 3 dried tomatoes, chopped. Toss pasta with tomatoes and some of the oil from the jar. If you have fresh basil, chop it and add to the dish. Serve with grated Parmesan or Romano cheese. Pass a pepper mill, too.

This somewhat more elaborate recipe comes from Michelle Hancock at the Fort Worth Star-Telegram.

PASTA WITH TWO TOMATOES

2 large ripe tomatoes, seeded and coarsely chopped
4 oil-packed sun-dried tomatoes, drained and coarsely chopped
1 clove garlic, chopped
1/2 cup extra-virgin olive oil
Salt, pepper to taste
1/2 pound penne rigate or other tube-shaped pasta
1 cup fresh basil leaves, loosely packed

Yields 4 servings

Combine fresh and sun-dried tomatoes, garlic, oil, salt and pepper in large bowl. Marinate at room temperature 45 minutes, stirring occasionally.

Boil pasta in salted water until al dente, 7 to 10 minutes, stirring occasionally.

Coarsely chop basil and combine with pasta. Serve immediately or at room temperature. Although this recipe does not specify grated cheese, it would not go amiss.

Pasta with Soft Cheese and Dried Tomatoes: Follow previous recipe, but add a wedge of soft ripened cheese, such as Camembert or chevre. (This is for cheese lovers.) Mix cheese into hot pasta so that it melts.

In Sandwiches: Use a few pieces of dried tomatoes, drained, in sandwiches.

In Salads: Use thinly sliced dried tomatoes in a tossed salad; some of the oil may go into the dressing.

Bruschetta: Lightly paint slices of French or Italian bread with olive oil. Run under a broiler to toast. Top with chopped, drained dried tomatoes and some fresh herbs. Serve as an appetizer. Or puree dried tomatoes and some of their oil in a blender or food processor; spread mixture thinly on toast. Sprinkle lightly with grated Parmesan or Romano cheese, if desired.

The following recipes came from *The Dallas Morning News*:

TOMATO GOUGERE

1/2 to 3/4 cup chopped dried tomatoes
1 cup water
1/2 cup (1 stick) unsalted butter
Pinch salt
1 cup sifted flour
4 eggs, at room temperature
4 ounces Gruyere cheese, diced (about 1/2 cup)

Yields 12 servings

Preheat oven to 425 F. Grease baking sheet.

Cover tomatoes with hot water and allow to soak for about 10 minutes. Drain, dry and chop fine. Set aside.

Put water, butter and salt in saucepan. Bring to a boil. Add flour all at once and stir vigorously over medium heat until the paste begins to pull away from sides of pan. Remove from heat and beat in eggs, one at a time. Stir in tomatoes and cheese.

Place heaping tablespoons of dough in small circle on baking sheet. Keep adding to outside of circle

until all dough is used. Bake for 10 minutes; reduce heat to 350 F and bake until golden, about 20 minutes more. Serve warm.

YOGURT CHEESE BAKE

1 cup Yogurt Cheese (recipe follows)
2 eggs
1/2 cup shredded cheese of choice
2 to 4 tablespoons cut up sundried tomatoes
1 teaspoon oregano

Yields 8 servings

Preheat oven to 350 F. Beat yogurt cheese with eggs until smooth. Add remaining ingredients. Spread in oiled 9-inch round baking dish or glass plate. Bake 30 minutes, until firm and slightly browned on top. Cool at least 10 minutes before serving. Best at room temperature.

Yogurt Cheese: Yogurt cheese is made by draining yogurt overnight in a funnel or strainer lined with a coffee filter or cheesecloth. Start with plain, non-fat yogurt; spoon into funnel and place over bowl or glass; refrigerate. Discard liquid that collects.

Variations: Add 2 cut up, canned artichokes or 2 sliced green onions, or up to 1/2 cup cooked, diced vegetables. Replace shredded cheese with 1/2 to 3/4 cup crumbled feta cheese. Replace oregano with 1 tablespoon chopped parsley or dill. For a crowd, triple the recipe, bake in a 9x13-inch pan and cut into 24 squares.

This cake will spice up your table

Fall is synonymous with football and tailgate parties, but why limit a good idea?

Tailgate fun can extend to band concerts, haystack rides and other seasonal outings.

A tailgate meal can be a great way to celebrate the season without limitations.

According to Susan Wyler, author of *Tailgate Parties* (Harmony Books, 1984), "The tailgate can be more elaborate than a conventional picnic because you're carrying everything you need in the back of your car, not on your back or in a basket on your arm. You can really turn it into a party."

Regardless of how elaborate you wish to make your spread, the logistics of taking a meal on the road can pose some challenges to the cook. According to Wyler, organization and a make-ahead strategy are key.

"I like to plan food that can be done in advance and will hold up well and will look terrific and taste great the next day."

To help save on preparation time, let the convenience offered by the supermarket deli help you. Buy sliced cold cuts and cheese there for quick sandwich assembly. Or, if time is really short, have the deli make the sandwiches for you.

Here are some other tips to help in preparing your tailgate feast:

Keeping cold food cold is one of the greatest challenges in planning a portable meal. Make sure there is enough ice in the cooler to keep everything cold.

List the equipment you will need for transporting and serving each item: large spoons, a few sharp knives, spatulas, covered plastic containers, plastic wrap, etc.

Pack plenty of paper plates, cups, plastic eating utensils, napkins and moist towelettes.

Take only as much food as people will eat during the day. Any food that is left in the cooler when you're ready to leave should be discarded, not taken back home.

Bring a few large plastic bags for clean-up. With those things in mind, you can enjoy the weather, the game and a delicious, easily assembled meal thanks to planning and the convenience of dairy products.

TANGY CARAMEL ICED SPICE CAKE

Cake:

1 cup (2 sticks) butter
2 cups firmly packed light brown sugar
3 eggs
1 cup seedless raspberry jam
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
2/4 cups all-purpose flour
1/2 cup unsweetened cocoa
2/4 teaspoons pumpkin pie spice
1 teaspoon baking soda
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 container (8 ounces) lowfat plain yogurt
1/6 cup chopped pecans

Icing:

1/4 cup (1/4 sticks) butter
1/4 cups firmly packed light brown sugar
1/8 cup milk
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
3/4 cups confectioner's sugar
1/2 cup chopped pecans

Yield one 13 by 9 inch cake
Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. For cake, cream butter in large mixer bowl. Gradually beat in sugar until light and fluffy. Beat in eggs one at a

time, beating well after each addition. Mix in jam and vanilla. Combine flour, cocoa, spice, baking soda and salt. Add dry ingredients alternately with yogurt, beginning and ending with dry ingredients. Mix well after each addition. Stir in nuts.

Spread batter evenly in well buttered 13 by 9-inch baking pan. Bake 45 to 50 minutes, or until wooden pick inserted in center comes out clean. Cool completely in pan on wire rack.

For frosting, melt butter in heavy 2-quart saucepan over medium heat. Stir in sugar and milk. Stir until sugar is dissolved. Increase heat and bring to boiling, stirring frequently. Boil 1 minute. Remove from heat. Cool to lukewarm, about 30 minutes. Pour into small mixer bowl. Beat at medium speed of mixer 1 minute. Mix in vanilla.

Gradually beat in confectioners sugar until creamy and fluffy. Spread over top of cake. Sprinkle with nuts. Store, covered, in cool place or refrigerator.



Kurtis takes sixth win at Detroit marathon

Compared to Doug Kurtis, the Detroit Pistons' back-to-back championships weren't much. After all, the Northville resident has won six straight Detroit Free Press/Mazda International marathons.

Kurtis' latest triumph came Oct. 19 amid stiff competition and even stiffer weather conditions. He overcame temperatures barely above freezing and a ¼-mile deficit in the final stages of the 26-mile race to take first place and a hefty \$7,000 check.

"Part of me just really wanted to win," Kurtis said. "I was lucky I was able to overtake him. He just ran out of gas at the 23-mile mark."

Kurtis posted a winning time of 2:19.25. It was his 66th time below 2:20, which ranks him second in the world.

The race began in Windsor, Ontario stretched through the the streets of Detroit and concluded at Hart Plaza.

Considering the conditions and the fact that he had run a marathon -- and won -- the week before, Kurtis was very happy with the win. He pulled the same trick a year ago.

"I thought last year was a big accomplishment," he said. "But to be able to come back and do it again was just great."

The 40-year-old said it's his train

ing, which includes 15 miles of road work a day, that allows him to do well competitively. At any rate, turning 40 has not dampened his enthusiasm for running.

"I'm having a blast," Kurtis said. "I expect to run for a long time even when I'm not competitive anymore."

The Northville resident won the Detroit race with an average of 5:19 per mile. Kurtis said wasn't sure how he was able to achieve that mark, since he trains at a pace of seven minutes per mile.

Taking \$7,000 home for his efforts was nice, he said. Winning prize money isn't the reason he continues to run, though.

"I do it because I have the opportunity of winning a race," Kurtis commented. "You can't put a dollar figure on that."

Kurtis wasn't the only Northville runner to do well at the marathon.

Katherine Hofman finished 36th in the open category with a time of

3:23:56. Donna Swanson finished fourth overall in the masters division with a time of 3:14:26, and Elaine Yagiela was 13th in 3:39:31.

For Swanson, it was her best finish at the Detroit marathon. She averaged 7:24 per mile. Swanson said the race was made more difficult by the poor weather.

"It was probably one of the toughest weather conditions I've run in," she said.


Swanson won \$500 for her showing.

"It was a nice surprise," she added. "I knew I trained well for it, but I was surprised at my finish."

The Northville resident runs two to three marathons per year. She trains nearly every day, running up to 45 miles per week.

Swanson she gets a lot out of the sport.

"I like the overall feeling of fitness," she said, "and keeping the weight off."




Doug Kurtis says the cold weather didn't bother him a bit at the Free Press/Mazda Marathon.





Anthony Edwards joins cast of CBS' 'Northern Exposure'

Hyperallergic lawyer finds home in Cicely

"Quirky" describes many of the residents of the town of Cicely, Alaska, and the series in which they can be found, CBS' *Northern Exposure*. The adjective certainly applies to the town's newest resident, who will join the show for seven episodes beginning Monday, Nov. 2.

Anthony Edwards (*Top Gun*, *Mr. North*) plays Mike Monroe, a corporate lawyer from the Minneapolis/St. Paul area afflicted with environmental illness, a chemical-sensitivity syndrome marked by allergic reactions to toxins. Having suffered too many

migraine headaches from new carpet and the like, Mike searched for a remote town with clean air and a doctor and found Cicely, one of the last refuges left for him on the mainland. There he sets up housekeeping in a geodesic dome.

Edwards describes his character as "one of those people who's seen the face of death and is learning to survive in his own dramatic way.

"He's incredibly well-educated on environmental issues, but in a real way, not a political way, because he had to know what happens when a benzene spill occurs and the effects of underground nuclear testing on

the environment. I think he's sympathetic because he sees himself as a barometer of the world's health. He's the canary in the coal mine."

How does the community take to the newcomer? Dr. Fleischmann (Rob Morrow) considers him a medical challenge, though Mike is also a hypochondriac, and his allergic symptoms amount to no more than sniffles and a sore throat. Maggie (Janine Turner) is, according to Edwards, "very intrigued by the character because he is unreachable. I think we're attracted to each other because we've cut ourselves off from society in different ways — me physically and she emotionally. So there's a good friendship developing there."

Maurice (Barry Corbin) lends Mike his old space suit to wear during allergic attacks, and Mike is free to walk about unprotected at other times, but he must wear gloves when handling paper. In an episode airing later this month, the ex-astronaut enlists the lawyer's help when authorities in West Virginia try to extradite metaphysical deejay Chris (John Corbett) for breaking parole seven years earlier.

"I think the greatest part of why Cicely works is that it's full of eccentric, crazy people, not unlike my character," Edwards offers as an explanation of *Northern Exposure's* Emmy-winning mystique. He says that while the characters are markedly different types, they are "very similar in their ability to be loving. As an audience, we like watching it because we see and feel both extremes."


Will Chris elude the long arm of the law? Will Maggie break through the new resident's barriers without making him sneeze? If a romance develops, will Mike survive the apparent curse on Maggie's boyfriends? Will Joel discover a cure for environmental illness, or will Maurice promote Cicely as a haven for the hyperallergic? 

STAR NOTES

The death of Anthony Perkins in September as a result of complications from AIDS was deeply mourned by both his peers and his legions of fans. The centerpiece of his legacy of work is, of course, his portrayal of the unbalanced Norman Bates in the *Psycho* film series. While his haunting performance as Norman made a lasting impression on world audiences, it also overshadowed his fine work in other films and plays.

Perkins began acting in summer stock at the age of 15, then made his film debut at 21 in 1953's *The Actress*. He appeared on Broadway and in TV dramas before returning to film in 1956's *Friendly Persuasion*; it was this role that earned him an Oscar nomination for best supporting actor.

Perkins delivered some of his best performances in the next few years, notably as a mentally ill ballplayer in *Fear Strikes Out* and a fledgling sheriff who turns to bounty hunting in *The Tin Star*. The films *Desire Under the Elms*, *On the Beach* and *Tall Story* began to propel Perkins to romantic-lead status, but 1960's *Psycho* forever changed his image.

Perkins can be seen this week in his last film role, as an obsessive, amateur detective on the trail of a serial killer in NBC's *In the Deep Woods*, airing Monday, Oct. 26.

Midseason replacements; NBC to air HBO original telefilm

With the first few casualties of the fall season, it's time to look for possible replacements. There's no shortage of back-up series at ABC, where Tom Arnold's *Jackie Thomas Show* is the most notorious of a long list. ABC also has a collection of unaired *Sibs* episodes, and is in production with new installments of *Jack's Place*. *Sirens*, a drama about three rookie policewomen, will probably show up this winter. Two new comedies — *Home Free* and *Where I Live* — are also in production.


CBS' long-awaited *Family Dog* is said to have reported in faithfully this month. The network also has *Good Advice*, a comedy starring Shelley Long as a family counselor with a philandering husband, and *Dr. Quinn, Medicine Woman*, a western drama starring Jane Seymour, in the wings.

Fox is working on a spoof of tabloid television in *Exposed*, starring Daphne Maxwell Reid. At NBC, Barry Levinson is producing *Homicide*, a serialized drama set in Baltimore. Roy Scheider is preparing to star in *Sea Quest*, and prodigal son Jay Tarses is working on a comedy. Tarses, whose *Days and Nights of Molly Dodd* became a cable hit after cancellation by NBC, said several years ago that he never intended to work for a network again.

HBO subscribers will have plenty of chances to see the made-for-TV drama *Blind Side*, a psychological thriller starring Rutger Hauer, Rebecca De Mornay and Ron Silver. After an initial run early in the new year, the movie will be presented on NBC in April or May. The move, which helps the producers raise money and saves NBC some of the cost of producing the film on its own, could be the beginning of a beautiful friendship for the business partners, though overexposure could water down pay cable's reputation for exclusivity.



After 'Days,' Easton turns to 'Nighttide'

Last spring, Michael Easton was named one of *People Magazine's* 50 Most Beautiful People, and millions of fans agree. Most recently, the good-looking actor could be seen daily on NBC's *Days of Our Lives* as Tanner Scofield, the rebel without a cause.

Unfortunately, the NBC brass didn't care much for Easton's rebel-like attitude around the set and chose not to renew his contract. Easton defends his actions by saying he only wanted to make the work better.

"Working on the soaps is very physically and mentally draining," says Easton. "Day in and day out, it is not some of the most artistically rewarding work you are doing. Sometimes I would walk out of the studio banging my head on the wall.

"You spend a lot of time just trying to make the material work and be believable, but because of the time element with daytime, sometimes it just doesn't happen," says Easton. For the most part, he was happy to leave the show and was ready to move on.

But Easton has moved on. He is starring in *Nighttide*, a prime-time movie with Emma Samms, Parker Stevenson and Joan Chen airing this fall on NBC. "It's a thriller with a lot of twists and turns in the plot," says Easton. "I play a guy named Shawn who is kind of a dark character and is not who he appears to be. It's a big change from Tanner."

Samms and Stevenson play a couple who appear to have it all - looks, money, success. The two slip away for a weekend at the beach, and that is where the tale of larceny and murder begins.

Easton prepared for his role by working out twice daily with a personal trainer and eating only fruits and vegetables. "I visualized this character as a very lean, muscular, hungry-looking man," says Easton.

So what happens after *Nighttide*?

Easton has done a multitude of jobs besides acting. He enjoys writing poetry and says writing is his first love.

"It is not easy for me, but it is what I like to do, better than acting." Of course, if things get too tough, Easton says, he can always go back to bartending.

Whatever happens, you get the feeling that this rebel will survive.

It's kind of scary 'In the Deep Woods'

NBC telefilm offers Perkins classy exit

Anthony Perkins takes a fine final bow in NBC's suspenseful *In the Deep Woods*, airing Monday, Oct. 26. Based on a chilling novel by Nicholas Conde (*The Religion*), the film is one of the best suspense-type movies the networks have produced in some time. Unfortunately, the format and limitations of mainstream television (commercials, etc.) does not provide for the kind of sustained tension a piece like this really needs.

Rosanna Arquette stars as Carol Warren, a successful author and illustrator of children's books. When a childhood friend becomes the latest victim of the Deep Woods Killer (a serial murderer preying on attractive career women), Carol is shaken by the realization that no one is entirely safe — or to be trusted.

A few days later at a book signing, Carol meets a tall, haunted-looking stranger (Perkins). He is Paul Miller, a

self-proclaimed detective determined to find and apprehend the killer responsible, he says, for the death of his daughter. Carol is shocked by Miller's icy revelation that his investigation is now centered on her own brother, and she abruptly ends their meeting. As she leaves, she realizes Miller is hiding much more than he is telling. She also feels confident she will see him again.

Arquette delivers an edgy intensity in what may be her best performance since *The Executioner's Song*, a perfect complement to Perkins' brooding presence. Chris Rydell is convincing as Tommy, Carol's dutiful, angelic-looking brother, and D.W. Moffett offers real charm and allure as Carol's dubious boyfriend, despite the worst haircut seen on television this year.

Writers Robert Nathan and Robert Rosenblum have crafted a skillful (though at times illogical) script from Conde's novel, and director Charles Correll keeps the action moving at an appropriately swift pace.







A punt, a pass and the presidency

The horse-race metaphor and other sports cliches have been overworked by journalists in describing the quest for the presidency. During the final week of the election campaign, however, ESPN offers an intriguing variation on the theme.

On Tuesday, Oct. 27, ESPN's Emmy-winning *Outside The Lines* series examines the link between the presidency and the sporting interests of our presidents in a special edition titled *Sports and the Presidency*.

"Americans are fascinated by the men they elect to lead them," says host Bob Ley, who spoke to both George Bush and Bill Clinton about their sports attitudes, interests and achievements. (At press time, Ross Perot had also been invited to participate.)

In addition to interviews with former presidents Richard Nixon and Gerald Ford, the special includes anecdotal recollections of Dwight D. Eisenhower, John Kennedy and Lyndon Johnson. Presidents Jimmy Carter and Ronald Reagan are also represented. Author George Plimpton and ABC commentator Jeff Greenfield provide additional commentary.

Ley says he hopes the show will give viewers a glimpse of the human side of the men who occupy the Oval Office. Of the relationship between sports and politics, he says that although sports is "certainly not a prime instrument of policy, it definitely reflects their personalities."

Back to 'Jack's' or Finola's finale?; never bet with your sister

Q: I would like to know about Finola Hughes. She was my favorite character on General Hospital as Anna Scorpio. I was pleased to see her again on Jack's Place, but now it's off the air. Will Jack's Place air again in the future? If not, will Finola Hughes be in any other programs? —Cindy Bailey, Portland, Ore.

A: Hughes was born in London, and she attended several prestigious private schools when she was young to study ballet. Her first dramatic role of prominence was in the London-based production of *Cats* playing Victoria, The White Cat.

After appearing in productions around the world for several years, Hughes landed the part of Anna Devane Lavery Scorpio on *GH*, winning many of the awards set aside for daytime television's best. Her work on *Jack's Place* continues; ABC has ordered 13 more episodes of the series.

Q: I am 10 years old and play baseball. Nolan Ryan is a special ballplayer to me. He is the best in the world. Could you tell me where I could write to him? —Berl Prouty, Carlsbad, N.M.
