

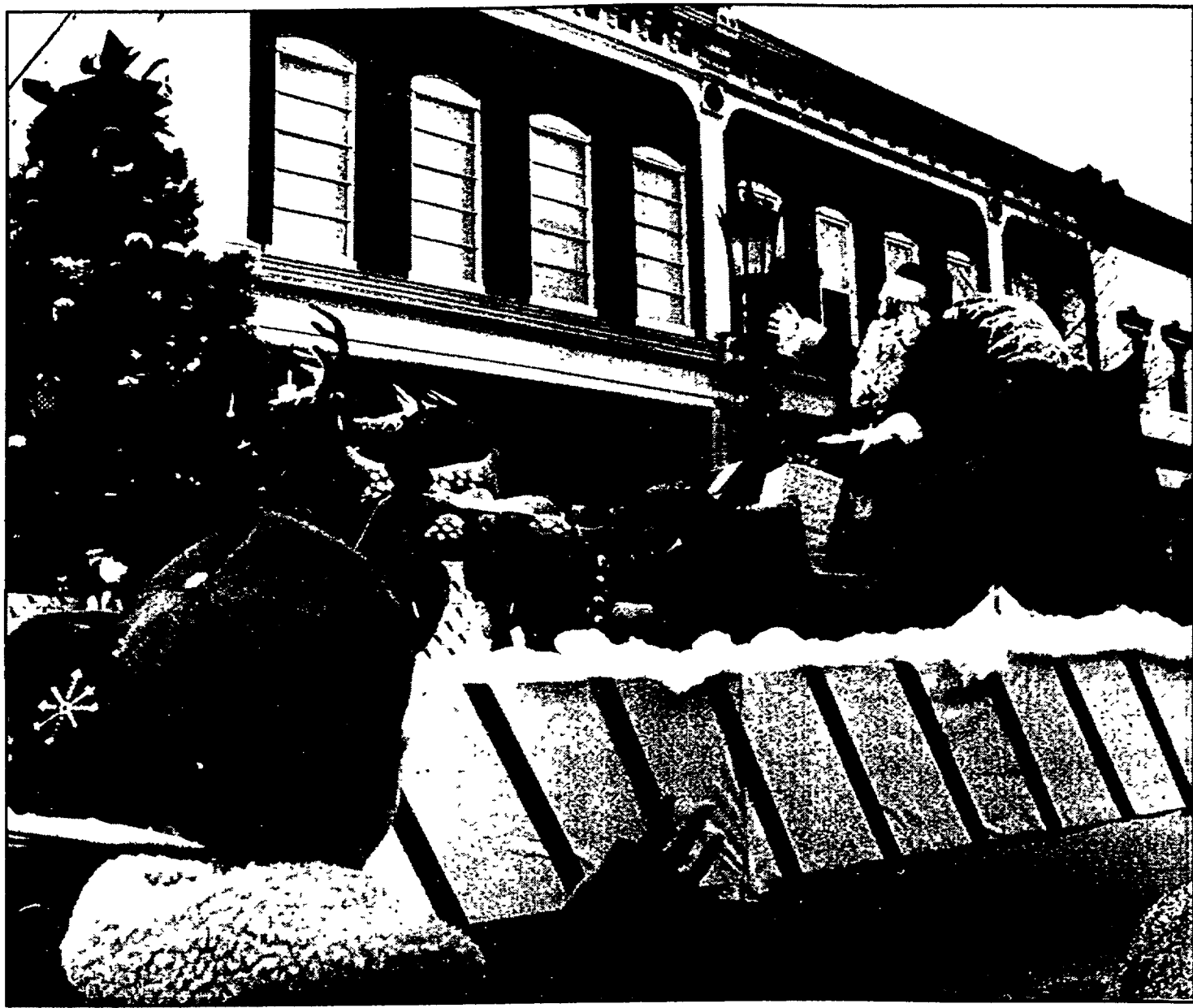

Festival of lights

Decorating effort seeks widespread support

Downtown retailers plan to deck their stores with ribbons of lights for the holiday season.

Lighting downtown Northville's shops, lampposts and trees, they hope, will help illuminate the city's image as a tourist attraction and shopper's mecca.

"We're going to go all out," said Brad Heureux of Bradley Advertising, who is coordinating the proposed Festival of Lights. "I've put together a merchant's group that will pool their

resources for advertising projects, and this is our first event."

The event begins on the evening of Friday, Nov. 27, as Santa Claus throws a switch to illuminate downtown Northville. Before then, the retailers hope to enlist the aid of the city's Department of Public Works to string lights along the second story of downtown buildings, and around the lampposts and trees. Wrought-iron Santa Claus and snowman frames will also be ringed in lights.

The lighted strands are just the beginning for the Festival of Lights, Heureux said. Horse

and carriage rides and carolers will be included as well.

Restaurateur Toni Genitti presented the plan to the City Council at its Oct. 19 meeting, and received a largely favorable response.

"We're going to try to pull in all of Main, all of Center and the municipal buildings," Genitti said.

Round one of BFI case nears end

Round One of a head-butting contest between Northville Township and Browning-Ferris Industries will be decided this week.

Thirty-fifth District Court Judge John MacDonald said he will settle by Friday a dispute over the township's authority to slap multiple tickets on BFI trucks cited for overweight load violations.

Tens of thousands of dollars in fines are at stake. The township's motor carrier program could, in part, also hinge on the outcome.

MacDonald last week heard arguments from township and BFI attorneys. The township contends it has the authority to write tickets for each overweight axle on trucks traveling through the township.

BFI, the solid waste firm that operates a landfill at the corner of Napier and Six Mile in Salem Township, says the township cannot assign multiple fines or violations to a single overweight truck.

Fining overweight trucks per axle is comparable to police writing a motorist 20 individual tickets for driving 20 miles over the speed limit, said BFI attorney Michael Jacobs.

The difference adds up. The township claims it can write a \$500 citation for each axle, an expense that could spiral into thousands of dollars, depending on the number of axles on a truck. BFI's reading of the law would top out tickets at \$500 per

overweight vehicle.

Township Attorney Timothy Cronin disagreed with that premise and said the motor carrier ordinance serves dual purposes: protecting both roadways and local residents.

He said overweight trucks "crack" roads and pose serious safety concerns to residents if trucks cannot stop because of heavy loads.

"The more axles (that are) overweight, the more safety problems," Cronin said, and asked MacDonald to allow the township to continue fining on a per-axle basis.

Part of the BFI/township argument, according to BFI, stems from BFI's belief that a permit issued the company by the Wayne County Road Commission allows it to exceed weight restrictions in exchange for road upkeep.

The township acknowledges the permit and does not see it as much of an issue, Cronin said.

Northville and Plymouth townships' motor carrier officers have tacked more than 50 overweight citations on BFI trucks during the past year. BFI's Jacobs also charged the townships with selectively enforcing the motor carrier code, in effect singling out BFI trucks.

Selective enforcement violates BFI's civil rights, Jacobs said. That argument is headed for trial. Jacobs and Cronin agreed. MacDonald will not comment on that portion of the township/BFI scuffle in his verdict this week.

Schools expand meeting records

Northville school officials say they aren't taking any risks in the gray area of the Michigan Open Meetings Act.

District leaders say it's unclear to them whether the district's five subcommittees of the Board of Education are required by law to take minutes at their meetings when no quorum of board members present—subject to the provisions of both the Open Meetings Act and the FOIA. Michigan's Open Meetings Act requires that public bodies keep minutes from meetings that contain the date, time and place of the meeting and tell who was present and what decision, if any, was reached.

According to Richard, both the Open Meetings Act and FOIA were written in simple language so there would be no room for misinterpretation of the law.

Paraphrasing the words of David Hollister, D-Lansing, a member of the state House of Representatives committee which authored the Open Meetings Act, Richard said, "The act was deliberately written in layman's language so you don't need a lawyer to understand it. The same with Michigan's Freedom of Information Act."

Reznierski said since subcommittees act solely as advisory committees to the full board and have no decision-making authority, he and the district's attorney believe sub-

committees are exempt from the law that requires public bodies to take minutes of meetings.

But there are those who dispute that and believe that the Open Meetings Act and Michigan's Freedom of Information Act leave little room for misinterpretation in "a gray area."

Tim Richard, chairperson of the Michigan Freedom of Information Committee, said subcommittees—regardless of whether there is a quorum of board members present—are subject to the provisions of both the Open Meetings Act and the FOIA. Michigan's Open Meetings Act requires that public bodies keep minutes from meetings that contain the date, time and place of the meeting and tell who was present and what decision, if any, was reached.

MainCentre sees new openings

After 18 months, downtown Northville's newest retail center is approaching full occupancy.

Singh Development Co. recently signed several new leases for its MainCentre building, said Commercial Leasing Director Judy VanNewKirk. The leases are for a permanent makeup clinic, carpet store and espresso bar.

The newest businesses bring the total number of signed retail leases to 13, leaving two unoccupied spaces, VanNewKirk said. She expected to receive a signed lease for one of the two remaining spaces this week.

Registered nurse Ann Carlan has moved her permanent makeup salon, Facialistics, into a MainCentre office on the building's south end. Carlan uses a technique called micro-pigment implantation to place pigment in the dermal layer of the skin and create or enhance facial features such as eyebrows and eyelashes. The technique is also used to apply permanent eyeliner or lip color. Carlan has been applying permanent makeup since May, she said, and recently returned from an advanced internship in Atlanta under the guidance of nationally known cosmetologist Annette Walker (see related story).

Unlike tattooing, Carlan said, per-

manent makeup is applied one spot at a time. "You get a very, very natural effect," she said. "You don't look phony; you look just like nature really improved on you. It's very becoming."

The procedure is also not as painful as some might think, Carlan said. "It's sort of a plucking sensation."

The typical procedure takes less than an hour, though more than one application may be necessary. The price for an eyeliner, eyebrow or lip-liner procedure is \$400.

Carlan's salon joins four other offices inside MainCentre, including a mortgage company, credit bureau, family therapist and jewelry maker. The offices are located downstairs, off

the southeast entrance to the building.

Jack Hollmeyer, who runs a store called Classic Carpet in Livonia, will move the retail arm of his floor covering operation to 122 MainCentre in December. "Dec. 1 is our target date, but you know how that goes," he said.

Hollmeyer certainly knows how the floor covering business goes, having spent more than a decade in it. "I've got a very nice base of business that I've developed over the last 12 years," he said.

His new store, Northville Floorcovering, will stock top-of-the-line Karastan carpeting, prefinished and un-

Robbery suspect bound over for trial

The Detroit man who allegedly robbed a Northville Township bank at gunpoint Oct. 28 was bound over to Recorder's Court on Friday.

Rafel Rodriguez Pouncy, 22, faces a Nov. 20 arraignment date in Detroit Recorder's Court on armed robbery and felony firearms charges.

Township police say Pouncy attempted to rob the Michigan National Bank branch at 40020 Five Mile at about 12:15 p.m. Oct. 28.

Police arrested Pouncy after a bank teller allegedly gave him \$738 in cash and an explosive dye pack disguised as money.

The dye pack reportedly burst into an eye-stinging cloud of red smoke just after Pouncy left the bank. He al-

legedly tossed the money from his vehicle onto Five Mile just before police arrested him on northbound Bradner.

Pouncy continues to be held in the Wayne County Jail on \$100,000 bond. He faces up to life imprisonment if convicted of the robbery and weapons charges.

Federal Bureau of Investigation agents intend to charge Pouncy with the Aug. 11 armed robbery of a Michigan National Bank at 37276 Six Mile in Livonia.

FBI officials said they will continue to investigate if Pouncy is involved in a spate of armed robberies in the metropolitan Detroit area over the past several months.

Pouncy sat quietly at Friday's preliminary exam at 35th District Court in Plymouth. Pamela Hewitt, a Michi-

gan National Bank teller, pointed out Pouncy as the gun-toting man who robbed her.

"He said he wanted to make a withdrawal," Hewitt said, responding to questioning from Assistant Wayne County Prosecutor Gary LaBret.

Hewitt said Pouncy gave her a small bag and showed her a bluesteel handgun, later discovered to be a .38-caliber semi-automatic. She said Pouncy was quiet during the alleged robbery.

"He never said anything after he said he wanted to make a withdrawal," Hewitt said. Hewitt identified Pouncy as the young African-American male pictured in a still photograph taken by a bank camera during the alleged robbery.

The picture appears to be of Pouncy, and the butt of what looks to

be a handgun protrudes from the waistband of his pants.

Township police Officer Matt Mayes identified Pouncy as the man he arrested on Bradner just after hearing of the alleged robbery at Michigan National Bank.

Mayes said he did not find money or a weapon in Pouncy's tan Ford Escort, but Pouncy told officers where they could find his discarded handgun.

Pouncy's attorney, Moncey Wilson, asked few questions of Hewitt and Mayes. He did ask if Hewitt had ever before seen Pouncy, the alleged robber.

Hewitt said she had not.

finished hard woods and vinyl flooring, as well as a selection of decorative and oriental area rugs. While the doors will open in December, Hollmeyer plans a grand opening celebration in late January.

Local couples Tom and Beth LeDray and Tim and Laura Mulligan are riding one of the hottest new dining trends with their MainCentre cafe. Their 110 MainCentre espresso bar,

Caffe Bravo, will offer gourmet tortes, cheese cakes, and "all kinds of pastries, muffins and cookies," Beth LeDray said. Besides the pastries, the cafe will offer a wide range of espresso-based drinks and spiced cider.

Confusion surrounds licensing

A new MainCentre tenant has been caught between a rock and state regulations when it comes to plying her craft.

Ann Carlan, owner of the permanent makeup salon Facialistics, is operating illegally, according to the state Bureau of Occupational and Professional Regulation. Assistant licensing administrator Colleen French said Friday that applying permanent makeup without a cosmetology license is a violation of the state occupational code.

But Carlan, a registered nurse, argues that her completion of an intensive two-day course in Detroit and a week of advanced studies in Atlanta was supposed to certify her to perform the procedure. The courses were taught by nationally

known cosmetologist Annette Walker, through her Alabama-based firm Dermouflage Clinics.

French said the state considers permanent makeup application, similar in technique to tattooing, different because it is performed on the face. Tattooists do not need a state license to operate.

"She is engaged in beautifying the body, the upper part of the body," French said. "Beautifying the upper part of the body is cosmetology. . . . If she was working on the knees or something, that would be tattooing."

Dr. George Walker, Annette Walker's husband and business associate in Dermouflage Clinics, said from Alabama that the firm's attorney had researched the Michigan laws extensively and found them to be contradictory. Walker said the cosmetology licensing requirement stemmed from a re-

quest for an attorney general's opinion from the state cosmetology board.

"He actually looked into the law and what he got was an opinion that says . . . no board within the state government within the state of Michigan can actually define its own limits. So the state board of cosmetology was actually out of order in saying that derma-technology could only be performed by cosmetologists."

State attorney general spokesman Chris DeWitt could not locate the cited opinions by press time Friday.

Performing cosmetology without a license can be punished by a stiff fine. A spa owner applying permanent makeup in Farmington Hills was fined \$350 recently for operating without a license. Her cosmetology license had expired (see story below).

Bookkeeping error leads to citation

A 1989 clerical error made by a bookkeeper at the Tamara Institut De Beaute in Farmington Hills has led to a \$350 fine against the spa's owner for operating without proper state licenses.

Spa owner Tamara Friedman was quoted as the main source in a Northville Record story about permanent makeup last Thursday.

Friedman admitted she had been cited for performing cosmetology services without a current state-endorsed cosmetology license.

According to the complaint filed with the state's Department of Licensing and Regulation, a state inspector found Friedman and an asso-

ciate performing services with expired licenses during a routine annual inspection of the spa on May 30, 1991.

Two violations and a subsequent fine were levied against her and the spa in June. Friedman was cited for her own expired license and for permitting Zhenya Kotikovskiy, whose license had also expired, to give a client a facial.

According to the inspector's report, Friedman's license had expired on Aug. 31, 1989, and Kotikovskiy's on Aug. 31, 1990. Both licenses were still not current on the state's May 30 visit to the spa.

Friedman said she learned her license had expired only when the state inspector asked to see it during

the inspection. Unknowingly, she showed him the expired license that hung on her office wall. Friedman said Kotikovskiy's license had been mailed to her former address and had yet to reach her new address.

She said the entire incident stems from a clerical error. The spa owner said her bookkeeper paid for and renewed two establishment licenses rather than renewing one establishment license and Friedman's own cosmetology license. She said the error hadn't been caught in 1990 because state inspectors hadn't asked to see her license then.

State licensing records confirm Friedman's explanation of the citation.

Friedman admitted to the com-

plaint at a hearing with the state regulatory department on Oct. 29, 1991. With her admission the state issued a final order, which wasn't handed down until June 9 of this year. Friedman paid the \$350 fine.

"It's just a clerical error and an oversight," Friedman said. "We have a legitimate place here, and since then we've held department checks to ensure that everyone who works here has a current license."

"I was not aware that the license had expired. I was totally sure my bookkeeper had paid the fee and renewed it."

"It's not good but it happened. . . . There's nothing wrong here; it wasn't a complaint from the health department or anything like that."

Thief takes instruments from the high school

A thief apparently picked a lock at Northville High School Nov. 3-4 to steal \$6,250 in musical equipment from a band room.

Fire Safety

Firefighters need to know about their enemy

In the popular film *Backdraft*, Fire Inspector Ringale speaks into his tape recorder as he examines the scene of a fire, and in so doing explains the phenomenon described by the movie's title: "Okay... okay... started in this room. Took its time. The air eventually ran out. It couldn't breathe. So it snuffed out. Died. No, it hibernated... still all that trapped heat sitting around. Laying low. Waiting for someone to open the door and revive it with one gulp of air."

Ringale's personification of fire behavior, making it seem almost as if fire were a living thing, lends drama to the film in typical Hollywood fashion. It is true, however, that a fire will usually behave in a predictable manner. Firefighters must know their enemy, and spend a good deal of time studying fire behavior in order to more effectively and safely combat it.

In order to exist, fire needs three things: fuel, heat and oxygen. When a fuel, such as a piece of wood, is exposed to sufficient heat it gives off vapors which, upon reaching its ignition temperature, will burn if suffi-

cient oxygen is present. If any one of these three elements is taken away, the fire will go out. Water will extinguish most fires because it removes heat. Putting a lid on top of a grease fire in a pan removes oxygen, and causes a fire to go out. The flame on your gas range dies when the gas (fuel) is turned off.

Most fires will progress through easily identifiable phases. The first, or "incipient," stage of a fire involves ignition, the bringing together of a fuel, heat and oxygen.

As the fire takes hold, it enters the second, or "free burning," stage. A large volume of flame, accompanied by the rapid production of smoke and other superheated fire gases, distinguishes this phase of a fire. If the fire is burning in a confined space, temperatures will also build during the second phase of a fire, reaching as high as 1,300 degrees Fahrenheit near the ceiling.

The third, or "smoldering," phase of a fire will typically be reached only in cases where the fire is burning in an enclosed space. In this phase, the fire will have consumed most of the available oxygen and will no longer be burning freely. Temperatures will remain very high for some time, how-

ever, trapped by the same circumstances that have cut off the supply of oxygen. Plenty of fuel, already heated to its ignition point, also remains. If fresh oxygen is suddenly introduced into the area of the fire before the heat is allowed to dissipate, a backdraft explosion will result.

Firefighters need to understand this process, and the means of recognizing a potential backdraft condition. In order to effectively fight the fire, if the first arriving fire fighters were to simply open a door they would run the risk of being blown back into the street, while the house suddenly reignites into a massive free-burning fire.

In order to prevent this, the structure must be ventilated above the level of the fire before doors or windows are opened at or below the level of the fire. This allows the trapped heat to rise up and out of the structure without feeding the fire with fresh oxygen. Once the heat has dissipated, entry can be safely made and any remaining fire extinguished.

Another phenomenon confronted by fire fighters at structure fires is called "flashover." Many ordinary combustible materials will have similar "ignition temperatures," that is,

the temperatures at which they will ignite and sustain combustion independent of a heat source.

If, for example, a fire starts in a living room and is freely burning, the temperature produced by this fire may ultimately reach the point where most of the other materials in the room simultaneously reach their ig-

niton temperatures. When this happens, the room literally "bursts into flame," producing an obvious problem for firefighters in this area. Again, ventilation can help prevent a flashover by reducing the temperature in the room.

The film *Backdraft* dramatically recreated the effect of a backdraft ex-

plosion. While the condition is not all that common in real life, it is a danger which firefighters must constantly be aware of. Fire is not a living thing, but understanding the nature and behavior of fire, firefighters can more effectively overcome it.

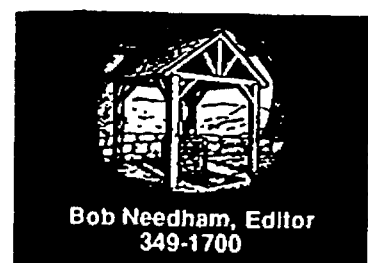

Our Opinion

New board faces challenges aplenty

It's out with the old and in with the new at Northville Township Hall.

A fresh cast of characters will take the Township Board stage Nov. 20, replacing seven incumbents who either were poached during the August primary or chose not to run.

Change was badly needed atop township government, and the new crew should invigorate a body that had become complacent, defensive, and unresponsive to the needs of the community.

The seven electees — Karen Baka, Sue Hillebrand, Rick Engelland, Mark Abbo, Barbara O'Brien, Gini Britton, and Russ Fogg — face numerous difficult challenges, perhaps none as great as the need to regain public trust in township government.

A grace period will accompany the incoming board as it tests its wings, but a backroom deal gone awry or a too-cozy relationship could quickly destroy the new group's viability.

Openness and honesty are essential to changing the public perception of Northville Township government. We trust the new board will take especially firm steps to ensure it operates in above-board fashion.

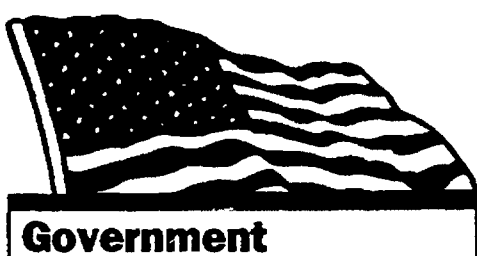
Problems are many, and easy answers few, in the township. The township's financial obligation to the Western Townships Utilities Authority must be studied; also needed is a detailed examination of combined police and fire services with Northville city and/or other local units.

The old administration helped create a potential hornet's nest when clerical workers decided to unionize, and that contract must be settled. New board members almost have to replace the current law firm — the Law, Hemming, Es-sad gang is too tainted to continue here — and other professional services contracts need to be reviewed.

Manager Richard Henningsen's status appears tenuous at best, and his position must be dealt with. Other department heads should be reviewed to see if they fit the new board's program.

And don't get us started on the old gang's bumbling, stumbling, and fumbling approach to the Beck Road park project.

The new Township Board must be willing to dive into its work. With all the challenges ahead, the board must be



well-versed in a bevy of issues and should call for and tap the knowledge and expertise of its citizenry.

Groups like Northville 2000 should be encouraged, because the township's critical studies and decisions should well up from its taxpayers, and not exclusively from out-of-town hired consultants as in past years.

This is a new dawn in Northville Township. The incoming board and residents should band together to see that the community avoids the dark clouds that engulfed the administration that failed so many tests.

We believe voters elected some talented individuals, but will confess dismay to comments offered by Treasurer-elect Rick Engelland just before the Nov. 3 election. In a letter to *The Northville Record*, Engelland urged voters to reject the lone Democratic trustee candidate in favor of four Republican hopefuls, lest the township be subjected to "tax and spend" liberal philosophy.

What tripe. First of all, partisan politics has no business dominating this form of grassroots government. Voters should look at the individual and not the party.

Second, the Township Board represents all township residents, not just the individuals of Engelland's political slant.

Finally, Engelland needs to remember that his election victory was anything but a mandate. He was the lone newcomer who did not face a challenge in the primary, and already has cultivated a reputation as someone who might be difficult to work with.

Engelland is bright and hard-working, but if he refuses to work with the rest of the board, outgoing Treasurer Jack Hosmer's thoughtful, no-nonsense approach will be greatly missed.

Cooperation, honesty, and ability are needed to right the township. We wish the new board — and residents — well in their quest.

Why do I always do this to myself?

Why is it that whenever we have one of our good ol' knock-down, drag-out arguments over what we're going to say in our editorials (the piece on your left as you hold this page, for those unfamiliar), I always end up on the short side. All it does is get me mad.

I remember last year when we were going to declare this paper's position on the Oakland County solid waste proposal, it was seven on one as I argued in favor of the plan. As I saw it, the county had sat on its hands long enough. We needed a solid waste policy, and this one was complete.

But the hand-wringing tree-huggers contended that the inclusion of an incinerator as part of the plan was enough to veto the whole thing.

I was so steamed after that encounter I had to walk around the block twice just to calm down.

I got my vindication on election day when the measure passed, though it's since been tempered by inaction and indecision over the building of the incinerator.

Then last week, I ended up on the short side twice. When it came time to endorse for 13th District U.S. Congress, I made my pitch for Bill Ford. Admittedly the guy was guilty of the arrogance that comes from serving 28 years and 14 terms in Congress.

But in my interview with him, he impressed me with his passion for his causes, and he seemed a man of action. He had a lengthy list of legislation that bore his signature both literally and figuratively.

Bob Geake, Ford's Republican opponent, wasn't a bad

choice. In fact I'd argued the loudest to endorse him in the primaries. I have a friend on staff in the Senate budget office who told me of the great work Geake had done on appropriations and getting Michigan's budget balanced.

But his negative campaign was a big turnoff. Why, I wondered, would a man with a strong record as a state legislator downplay his long suit to attack the reputation of an opponent who was only marginally culpable?

Again I was outnumbered, but again I got vindication on election day.

Finally, there was the argument over Proposal A. The plan to limit increases on property tax assessments to 5 percent a year had merit, especially in a growth community like ours where assessments have been skyrocketing.

Unfortunately I saw it as a Band-aid trying to cure a head cold. It would create situations wherein identical homes might have radically different taxes (especially unfair in this area where subdivisions tend to propagate identical homes).

It would also give our schools and governments less money to work with. If I believed government could learn to live within its means that would be fine, but I'm too cynical to believe that would ever happen. Paid administrators and elected officials alike would just pass the buck, keeping their costly pet projects intact while making cuts that would hurt those who didn't deserve it.

The penny-pinchers shouting me down said Proposal A would remove a disincentive for people, especially retirees, who had found a home they liked, but couldn't afford to stay in it.

On election day, A went down, and I had my solace.

Somewhat I think there's a reason why the names Rick Byrne and Rick Blaine sound so much alike. Like the jilted lover of *Casablanca*, I somehow can't resist battling on the side of the underdog.

Schools to start keeping more meeting minutes

"We aren't talking about technical, legal jargon. These are meant to be laws the public can read and understand."

Richard said Rezmierski's need to consult with the district attorney sent up a red flag.

"Whenever a public body insists it needs to talk to its attorney about the Open Meetings Act, it's usually because they want to find a way to close a meeting."

"You don't need an attorney to understand these provisions of the Open Meetings Act," Richard said.

The district's five subcommittees meet regularly to discuss issues. They exist to research and study issues that affect the schools and cut down on the time the full board would use to review things as agenda items. Three board of education members are appointed by the board president each year to sit on subcommittees, along with an administrative liaison. Rezmierski also sits in on all the sub-

committee meetings. The administrator is the one responsible for reporting out any recommendations the members of the subcommittee may have reached.

More often than not, however, there are more than the three appointed board members at subcommittee meetings. Last month at the curriculum, finance, and policy subcommittee meetings there was at least a quorum and in most cases six of the seven board members in attendance. That constitutes more than a quorum, and there are no official minutes from any of those meetings.

Rezmierski said since he can't control which or how many board members come to subcommittee meetings, he's requested all subcommittees take minutes of their own meetings.

"It's too mind-boggling to frog with how many board members show up," he said. "It's just too hard to tell whether one, two, three or more will come and make it a quorum."

Subcommittee chairpersons, who are school board members appointed by the board president, say they haven't kept official minutes themselves. Nor do they ask a secretary to do it for them.

Facilities Subcommittee Chairperson Jay Dunkerley said he thought the committee wasn't required keep minutes if a quorum was not present. He said his committee usually reviews contracts and building plans and uses the contractors' reports as minutes for the meeting.

"We don't have the kind of minutes that you are describing," Dunkerley said Friday. "We have our notes and

in some cases a summary of our agenda, but most of the time we are just going over reports. In those cases the reports are the minutes because they are self-explanatory."

"But, no, we have not had regular minutes on our regular meetings because we had less than a quorum," he said.

As the administrative liaison for the Policy Subcommittee, Robert Somson takes unofficial minutes at those meetings and then routes them out to fellow committee members, board members and school administrators. Somson said he's always done it as a method of keeping the

lines of communication open and outsiders abreast of what's going on with the Policy Subcommittee. But even those minutes are just his notes and what he calls "working minutes."

Secretary Margery Dobbs confirmed that there are no official minutes on file from any of the subcommittee meetings, even though the form used to post all meeting notices says there will be minutes available.

Following the announcement of all meetings, the notice reads: "Proposed minutes of said meeting will be available for public inspection during regular business hours, at the Superintendent's Office, Board of

Education Offices, 501 West Main, not more than eight business days after said meeting and approved minutes will be available for public inspection during regular business hours, at the same location, not more than five business days after the meeting at which they are approved."

But what the notice promises, school officials can't deliver.

Dobbs said she also couldn't find minutes taken at any of the two full board's study sessions held earlier this year. The two study sessions dealt with Rezmierski's first performance review and with proposed busing changes at the high school.

If you ask a winemaker when cabernet sauvignon should be harvested, they might say, "it depends." If you question whether it's better to use American or French oak or what proportion of new barrels is recommended, the winemaker will again answer, "it depends."

Harvest criteria are tied to climatic conditions. The warmer the growing season, the earlier the harvest. The use of oak barrels, on the other hand, depends on the intensity of the harvested fruit. Rich, intensely perfumed fruit can handle, and in fact requires, a large percentage of new oak barrels to tame its aggressive character.

Fruit with a milder personality would be completely dominated by new wood and is better aged in barrels that have been used in previous vintages.

We asked Julia Iantosca, winemaker at William Wheeler Winery in Sonoma's Dry Creek Valley, to explain how she selects barrel types for aging wheeler's premium chardonnay and cabernet sauvignon. To answer our query she prepared a tasting of five experimental lots of the 1991 William Wheeler Chardonnay, each aged in barrels made of different oaks by a variety of coopers.

Of the five chardonnay samples, one was aged in American oak and four in French. Of the four French barrels, one was made in Burgundy by Tonnellerie Vicard and three in Burgundy by Damy, Boute and Billon. The names of the coopers are not important. What is important is how the barrels change the taste of the wine.

The chardonnay was grown in the Russian River Valley, a very cool growing area in Sonoma County that is excellent for premium chardonnay. Of the first five wines tasted, each was fermented in a different oak with the same yeast and none completed malolactic fermentation (ML).

Several samples showed that the oak dominated the wine's fruit character. This is a negative for us, since we like the fresh fruit aromas and flavors in chardonnay. Other samples illustrated oak characters that we described as coarse, sweet, vanilla, toast, smoke or coffee.

Red: 1988 Dominus Estate Cabernet Sauvignon (\$45), 1988 Stag's Leap Wine Cellars SLV Cabernet Sauvignon (\$30), 1984 Rutherford Hill Library Reserve Cabernet Sauvignon (\$28), 1990 Shafer Merlot (\$21), and 1989 R.H. Phillips Syrah "EXP" (\$16/500ml).

White: 1989 Grigich Hills Chardonnay (\$35), 1990 William Hill Reserve Chardonnay (\$20), and 1990 Chateau St. Jean Robert Young Vineyards Chardonnay (\$30).

Sparkling: Domaine Chandon Etrole (\$25), 1988 Scharffenberger Blanc de Blancs (\$19), and 1989 Iron Horse Wedding Cuvee (\$30).

Consumers don't know the price of the wines when they voted. We wonder if this information might have influenced their vote.

Believing the answer to the question is "yes," we're recommending some overlooked values: 1990 Meridian Chardonnay (\$11), 1989 J. Lohr Seven Oaks Cabernet Sauvignon (\$12), and 1990 Chateau Souverain Merlot (\$9).

Actually, we could recommend any wine from Chateau Souverain for their high quality/price ratio. Right now these wines are hard to beat.

EVERYONE'S OIL

Olive oil is more than just salad dressing

For some people, there's hardly a day that goes by when they're not cooking with olive oil.

Whether it's sauteeing vegetables in a pure olive oil for a summer frittata or mixing an extra virgin olive oil with vinegar and herbs for the very best salad dressing, olive oil is one of the most precious commodities in the kitchen.

Why refer to an olive oil as a commodity? Although an everyday, pure olive oil such as Berio, Plagniol or Sasso is relatively moderately priced at \$8, or \$9 for 1.5 liters, an elite, extra virgin olive oil such as Badia a Coltibuono costs about \$20 for a 1/2 liter bottle. Twenty dollars for a 1/2 liter bottle may be considered extravagant. Is it worth it? Well, that's a matter of taste.

With the new awareness of healthy food preparation, there has been a proliferation of olive oils in the grocery store and gourmet markets. Choosing an olive oil has been elevated to an art much like that of appreciating fine wine. No doubt, choosing the right one has probably already begun to bewilder your mind, as well as your palate. Understanding how olive oil is processed, and the criteria for labeling, will help you to select the oils

which best suit your needs.

Olive trees thrive mostly in Mediterranean countries. About 95 percent of the world crop comes from the Mediterranean. A small percentage comes from California. And although Italy may be synonymous with olive oil to most of us, Spain actually leads in world production. Yet, to most gourmets and food professionals, Italian olive oil is the finest on earth, and we can't disagree.

There are over 60 varieties of olive trees. The flavor of each of them varies upon the specific soil content and climate. Generally, the oils from Northern Italy are full-bodied, velvety smooth with a strong olive flavor which is often peppery. Olive oils from the south of France are golden in color, lighter in weight than the northern Italian oils, and often taste fruity. They're ideal when blended with a raspberry vinegar for a salad, and especially nice when used for a mayonnaise or mayonnaise-based sauce. Spanish oils are generally full-bodied, or heavier than the Italian oils with an earthy flavor which is often described as coarse. One exception is L'Estronell, an extra-virgin oil from Lerida, in northern Spain. It's smooth, has a

good olive flavor, and retails for about \$7 a 1/2 liter.

Olive oils not only differ in flavor, quality, color and price, but also in their use. The super premium, estate bottle oils are hand-made from the harvesting to the grinding of the olives between stones for extraction of the oil. These are extra-virgin oil with up to 1 percent acidity, they're sometimes found in grocery stores, but more often in gourmet food shops like the Merchant of Vino (Birmingham, Troy and Southfield), Williams-Sonoma (Somerset Mall, Troy and Laurel Park Mall, Livonia), J. Hirt and Rocky Peanut Co. (Eastern Market, Detroit).

These and other extra virgin olive oils should be reserved for salads, or drizzled over a bruschetta appetizer of toasted, crunchy bread, fresh sliced tomatoes and fresh basil leaves or tossed with garlic into a pot of hot linguine and grated Parmesan cheese. High heat destroys the delicate flavor of extra-virgin oils to say the least.

Marc Jonna, manager of Birmingham's Merchant of Vino, is always on the lookout for the newest in top quality olive oils. For everyday sauteeing and pan frying, Joanna suggests cooking with pure

olive oil such as Berio or Colavita.

"Since most extra-virgin oils have a low smoking point, around 300 degrees, using an expensive oil for cooking is a waste of money as well as of a fine oil," he said. "Although, I do recommend using extra-virgin oil with some delicate foods which burn easily, like garlic." Pure olive oils, as with peanut oil, have a smoking range just over 400 degrees up to 460 degrees.

Basically, there are two types of quality olive oils to choose from, disregarding those labeled as "light" oils which can describe anything from a light colored oil, to an oil light in weight and generally void of flavor, pure olive oils and extra virgin oils.

An extra virgin oil legally cannot be extracted with the use of heat or chemicals. Those designated extra virgin can only be pressed once either by hand or mechanically. Some are filtered for clarity and some are not dependent upon the philosophy of the bottler.

Pure olive oil, on the other hand, is an oil which consists of a blend of refined olive oil and virgin olive oil. The process of refining the oil can be either a chemical or a physical process.

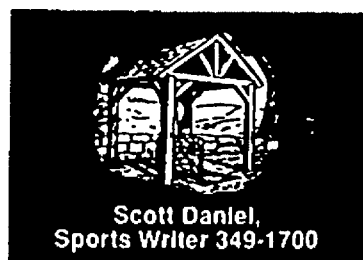

Hoopsters fall in first round of conference playoffs to Stevenson

It didn't take long to figure out the Mustang basketball team had about as much chance of beating Livonia Stevenson Thursday night as George Bush had of being re-elected.

The Spartans were 71-23 landslide victors over Northville in the opening round of the WLA playoff. Livonia, 18-0 and No. 9 in Class A, overwhelmed and outmatched the Mustangs.

Northville drew Stevenson, which finished atop the conference during the regular season, by virtue of its eighth-place showing. Coach Bob Shoemaker said the Spartans are the best team in the WLA.

"I think they are a team that plays well together," he said. "They execute and run the floor well."

Northville will play Farmington Hills Harrison tomorrow (at 7 p.m.) in the second round. The Mustangs, 4-13 overall and 4-8 in the conference, need a win to play for fifth place Saturday. A loss would drop them to a battle for seventh place.

Stevenson showed why it's one of the state's best in the first quarter.

Livonia came out quickly, executing its offense almost flawlessly. The Spartans worked the perimeter with crisp passing to open shooters.

Karen Groulx hit a three-pointer at the top of the key to give Stevenson a 5-0 lead at the 7:20 mark. Julia Birmingham then scored on a pass from Beth MacLean to put Northville on the scoreboard.

Two more three-pointers by Groulx gave the home team a 13-4 with a few minutes remaining in the period. Stevenson led 19-6 at the end of one.

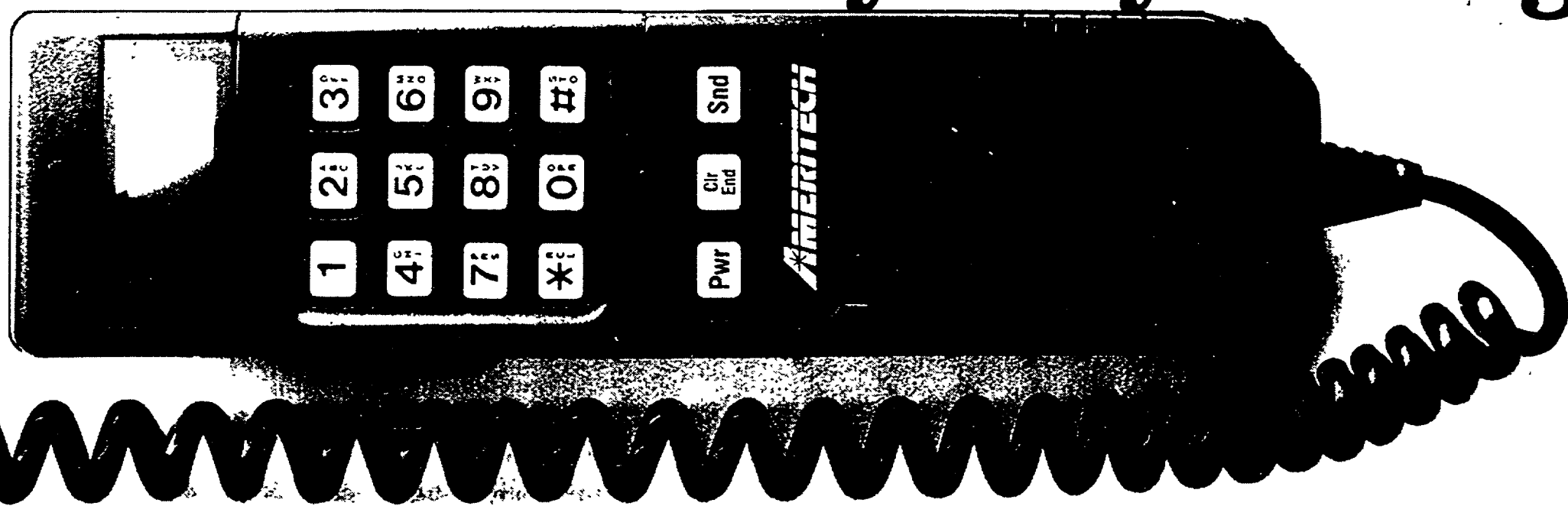
The Chieftains added two to that margin by halftime. Krista Howe led the Mustangs with six in the second while Sander and Krupansky each added two.

ABC's 'Jacksons'

good, no thriller

Music, parents' portrayals prove highlights

"The title of our miniseries tells the story," says Stan Margulies, executive producer of ABC's five-hour musical drama, *The Jacksons: An American Dream*, airing Sunday and Wednesday, Nov. 15 and 18. Together with partner and former Motown Records executive Suzanne De Passe, Margulies believes he has helped to create a program that "reinforces the age-old belief that a strong family can make any dream come true in this country, given talent, hard work and ambition."

Joseph Jackson's original dream was a successful musical career for himself. An able guitarist and vocalist, Joe planned to move to California and take his stab at show business, but the plans were scuttled by the unexpected pregnancy of his girlfriend Katherine. The couple married and settled in Gary, Ind., where Joe took a job at a steel mill.

But his dream didn't die. As the

family grew, Joe saw in his talented children the potential for stardom. A guitar for Tito was the first of many instruments and pieces of equipment Joe brought into the house, transforming the living room into a rehearsal studio. Relentlessly, Joe pushed his boys (the girls got their chances later, after the breakthrough of the Jackson Five) through practice after practice, often bringing one or more to tears, but never losing sight of his dream.

Lawrence-Hilton Jacobs, long relegated to straight-to-video action films, makes an unforgettable Joe Jackson. Through Jacobs' forceful, carefully crafted performance, we see Joe as a man whose thwarted ambitions and need for a better life blinded him to how hard he was pushing his children.

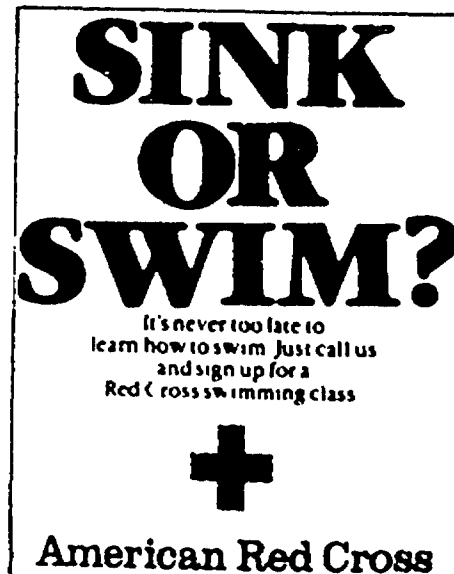
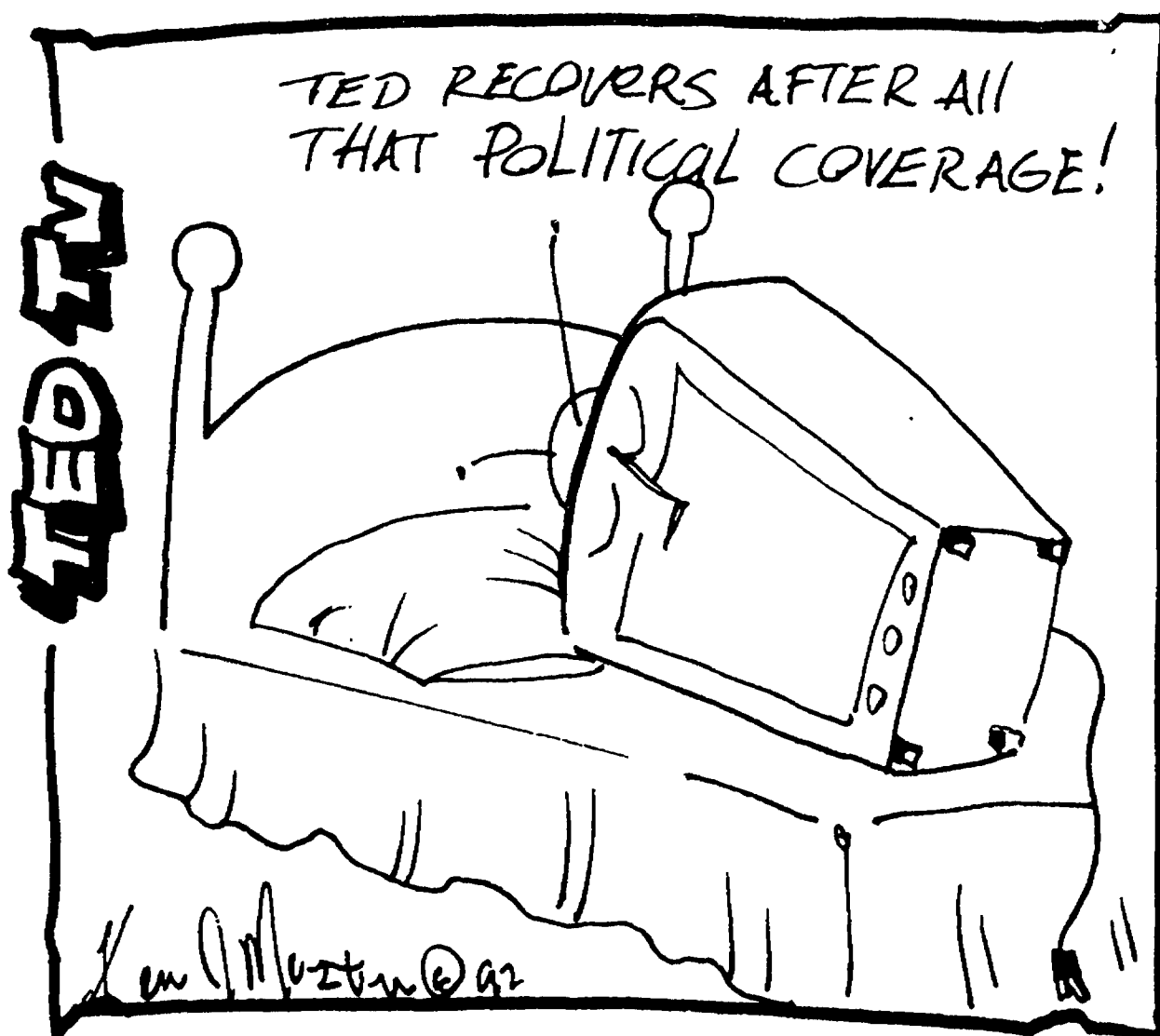
Angela Bassett is warm and sympathetic as Katherine, whose support bound her family in difficult times. The children are played at different ages by three sets of actors. The stand-out performances include Falyn Bryant's sensitive portrayal of eldest daughter Rebbie, and Damon Morris as the oldest of the show's three Jermaines. Wylie

Draper draws the difficult task of portraying the adult Michael and offers only a glimpse of the singer's strange, ultrasensitive relationship with his family and the world around him.

In the supporting ranks, Vanessa Williams makes a classy, eye-catching De Passe, and Holly Robinson does her own singing in an elegant cameo as Diana Ross. Billy Dee Williams brings both glamour and warmth to his small, flashy turn as Motown founder Berry Gordy.

Still, the miniseries is not without its flaws. The work contains isolated moments of TV-style drama—Joe ridiculing a prepubescent Marlon in rehearsal, Katherine's anger and tears at learning of Joe's infidelity—but the only continuing emotions in the piece are love, hope and the ambition to sing, sing, sing. Didn't anyone ever question the worth of their pursuits? Were there no encounters with racism or incidents of dissent as the other performing family members increasingly became Michael's sidemen? And were the Jacksons exempt from the normal agenda of spats, squabbles and divisions that plague other families?

Omissions such as these render *The Jacksons* merely a pastel diorama of the Jacksons' lives, short on excitement and long on caution, an inoffensive, entertaining, cartoon that trivializes both a powerful moment in popular music and the very real drama of family life. The miniseries' message seems to be tap your toes, sing along and don't look too hard. It's as simple as A-B-C.
