Mental patient charged in township car thefts

A Northville Regional Psychiatric Hospital patient accused of stealing a township resident's car Nov. 6 was arrested in Detroit Thursday after a second car was stolen.

Jeffrey Adams, 32, was arraigned on two charges of car theft Friday at 35th District Court.

He faces five years in prison or a \$2,500 fine for each charge.

This is not Adams' first brush with the law. He was the primary suspect in the August 1991 theft of a 1986 Ford truck from a construction site that abuts the state hospital, but was never charged for the theft.

A police check of his criminal record turned up one prior conviction, for breaking and entering into an automobile in Detroit last year. He is still on probation for that offense.

Adams, a patient at Northville Regional Psychiatric Hospital, apparently has walked away from the hospital twice in the past two weeks.

On Nov. 6, he allegedly stole Dennis Buckshaw's 1988 Oldsmobile 98 while Buckshaw was inside getting his children ready for school. The Crestview Circle resident had just backed the car out of his garage that morning to warm it up, and stepped inside of the house briefly to collect his children. When they got back outside, the car was gone.

The Olds was found in Detroit and returned to Buckshaw, who found Adams' Northville Regional patient identification bracelet inside.

Adams allegedly struck again just before 10 a.m. Thursday, Nov. 12, walking up to a Winchester Drive resident who had just started her 1992 Ford Explorer in her garage. He asked for a ride to the highway and when she refused, he hopped into the back seat.

The woman fled from the car and ran to a neighbor's house to call police.

Adams apparently then drove toward Detroit, leading Livonia police on a high-speed chase along the way be-

fore they broke off the chase for safety reasons. Detroit police arrested him shortly thereafter when they spotted him running a red light.

The Winchester Drive resident, who asked that her name not be used for fear of retaliation, said before her testimony at 35th District Court Friday that the incident left her shaken and concerned.

"It scared me, especially after reading this," she said, holding up a copy of the Record article on the Nov. 6 theft. "I thought, 'Gee whiz, this fellow's slipped out twice and now he's slipped out a third time'... They just need a more secure place, in my eyes."

Dennis Buckshaw, who also testified at Friday's arraignment, agrees. Buckshaw is organizing a petition and considering other actions to force the hospital to install an effective security fence around the facility. A six-foot fence was constructed in early 1991, but it has not kept patients from leaving.

Merchants throughout downtown Northville will offer refreshments including hot chocolate, punch and doughnuts.

The fun continues Friday, Nov. 27, with the start of Northville's Dickens Christmas. Downtown merchants attired in Victorian finery will hand out snacks between 2-5 p.m., and Scrooge himself will roam the sidewalks, handing out coupons for discounts at local stores.

The community tree will be lit at 6 p.m. at the Main Street bandshell.

Scholarships immortalize graduates

Nobody lives forever, except maybe George Burns, but for as little as \$3,000 you can have your name immortalized in the form of a scholarship endowment to Schoolcraft College.

Former Plymouth resident Bob Barbour did it last September, establishing an endowment scholarship in honor of his late wife.

Barbour was a regional vice president of the National Bank of Detroit in 1964 when the college was formed, and he worked closely with college financial officials to lay the foundation for what Schoolcraft has become.

Barbour (now retired and living in Arizona) turned over an undisclosed sum of money to Schoolcraft for the purpose of creating an "endowment fund" that will likely provide an annual \$400 scholarship to industrious students in the health field for years to come.

Barbour's late wife, Loraine, developed Alzheimer's and he found that hiring a trained health care aide wasn't easy. Also, while the couple lived

in Plymouth, Loraine volunteered for the Red Cross and at area hospitals.

"I don't want any publicity," Barbour said. "But if telling my story gives someone else the idea to help students, go ahead."

With his gift to the college, Barbour joined 21 other individuals and organizations who have set up endowment funds to provide scholarships or to buy equipment.

Among the other Schoolcraft benefactors are Livonia residents Marge and Robert Polley, whose daughter, Cindy Lee, was killed in a traffic accident in 1990.

A 1989 graduate of Stevenson High School, Cindy was a freshman at Schoolcraft studying culinary management when she died.

Since Cindy had been attending college thanks to several scholarships, her parents established the Cindy Lee Polley Memorial Scholarship endowment fund in the amount of \$3,000. Since then the Polleys have added almost \$800 to that.

The donated money is invested and generally earns 7 percent interest, said Schoolcraft spokeswoman Sandra "Sam" Florek. The interest income is then put to good use for the college, or the scholarship winners.

An additional 20 people or organizations have set up scholarships with Schoolcraft, whereby a cash donation is made to the college every year to pay for a scholarship.

But not everyone who gives a scholarship endowment to Schoolcraft wants to be publicly recognized.

About a year ago an individual who requested anonymity walked into the college offices unannounced with a check to establish an endowment scholarship in the name of Eileen Moore.

"For someone to just come in off the street with that kind of money is just incredible," Florek said. "There are few shocks in this business, and that was one of them."

Teacher-pupil ratios climb to record levels

When the millage request was voted down the average class size in Northville went up.

Average class sizes in the district are the highest they've been since 1974 according to David Bolitho, assistant superintendent for administrative services, who gave a thorough staffing and enrollment report at last Monday's school board meeting.

In his report, Bolitho shared teacher per pupil ratios and average class size statistics that date back to the 1974-75 school year.

With the exception of the two middle schools and the high school, kindergarten and elementary teacher/pupil ratios are at an all time high. This year middle school teach-

ers have an average of 22.55 students in each of their classes. While that's not the middle school record, which was 25.18 in 1975-76, it is considerably higher than the ratios in the past seven years. The same holds true for the high school which reports a 26.22 students per teacher ratio this year. That figure was exceeded in the 1979-80 school year by .11 when the high school had 127 fewer students as a 10th, 11th, and 12th grade high school.

Comparatively, average class sizes for the K-12 program are also at the highest they have ever been and student enrollment is up over head counts from the last 14 years.

In the kindergarten the average class size is 26.5 students. That's up 4.93 students from last year. To make matters worse there are 16 more kindergartners this year being

Ford extends date for sale of plant

The Northville community has gotten a short reprieve in its effort to obtain the Ford Valve Plant.

Peter Zervos of Zervos Construction in Southfield, who submitted a proposal in September to refurbish the plant for office space and lease part to the community for a library, said Friday that the Ford Motor Co. has extended a Nov. 13 deadline for a commitment to the proposal.

"It's a little more breathing room, which is good," Zervos said. "It gives the city a little more time to get their act together."

Ford did not set a date on the extension, Zervos said.

Zervos is head of the Northville Development Group, which has been working with Ford to purchase the

plant and rehabilitate it as an office-condominium complex. A 25,000-square-foot space on the main floor would be leased to the community for a new library under the development group's plan, to replace the existing 6,000-square-foot facility at city hall, and 10,000 square feet of basement space would be available for meeting rooms or other community uses.

The rest of the building would reportedly be leased to an insurance company and medical facility.

After 25 years, the library and meeting room space would be turned over to the city. Ford Field, the pond north of the plant and the Ford-owned land north of the pond would be turned over to the city immediately.



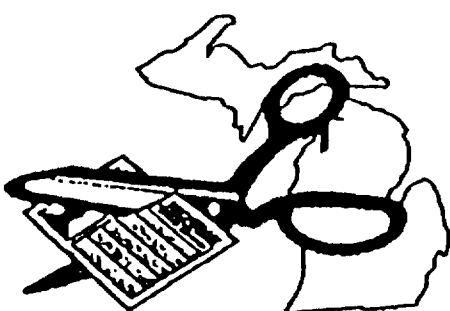

Suspect grabs \$1,000 from OLP office drawer

The man reportedly pulled out of an East Dunlap driveway and headed west just after 2 p.m., accelerated and drove into the eastbound lane before striking the other car. The force of the collision pushed the other car up onto the curb.

When police arrived, the man had blood on his face and hands from facial cuts and an injury to his mouth. He reeked of intoxicants and his voice was slurred and sometimes unintelligible. He could not stand without being held or leaning against something.

He was asked to submit a urine or blood sample at the police station rather than a Breathalyzer test because of his injuries, and he refused. He was charged with driving under the influence, driving while his license was revoked (for a previous drunk driving offense) and improper plates.

The man was held in protective custody until 8 a.m. the next day, when he was released on \$200 cash bond. A preliminary breath test administered just after midnight — 10 hours after the crash — had placed his blood alcohol level at .2 percent or twice the legal limit.

HOUSE BROKEN INTO: A Fairbrook home was robbed sometime between 9:35 a.m. Nov. 5 and noon Nov. 7. Stolen items included a Kenwood receiver and compact disc player, Cerwin Vega speakers and clothing. The items were valued at \$750.

The thief or thieves pried open a rear door to gain access.

"You have no idea what it's like going to bed in fear every night," Buckshaw said. "Does somebody have to get kidnapped? How much more has to happen to this community before they realize they have an obligation to us?"

"All of us are held hostage to that hospital."

Hospital director Dr. Walter Brown said his staff is reviewing the recent incidents and will consider tighter security measures. But as in

the past, he argued against a security fence because the hospital is supposed to be a medical facility and not a prison.

"I think these are unusual incidents; we haven't had any major incidents of any kind in a considerable amount of time," Brown said. "We'll look at the measures we have and see if they can be strengthened some way . . . We don't want patients walking away either."

35th District Judge James Garber ordered Adams sent to the forensics division of Detroit Recorder's Court

for a psychological evaluation, to determine if he is competent to stand trial.

Garber also entered a "not guilty" plea for Adams and set bail at \$10,000 cash. Unless he raises bail, Adams will remain in Wayne County Jail until his preliminary examination in several weeks.

One place Adams will not be returning to is Northville Regional.

"We discharged him . . . based on the fact that he left the hospital premises without permission," Brown said.

At the development group's proposed annual square-foot lease cost of \$13.42, lease payments for a library and community center would run about \$39,000 annually. The city's Ford Plant Study Committee has

questioned that cost and suggested other funding methods including a joint redevelopment to avoid paying Zervos to renovate the library space.

A proposed district library millage has been suggested as another potential funding method, since a district library could levy up to 2 mills for

its own use. But a library millage will not be voted on for at least two months.

Ford is considering at least one other offer for the plant, and another developer interested in a light manufacturing operation is reportedly waiting in the wings.

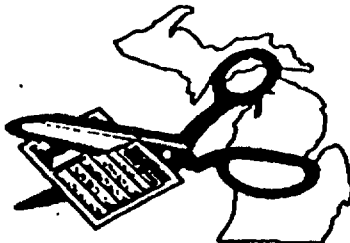

County program helps kids cope with divorce

Children suffer more than their parents know from the process of divorce, experts say.

Divorcing or separated parents become so focused on their own problems and disputes that they rarely recognize the impact of their actions and behavior on their children.

The Third Judicial Circuit Court of Wayne County wants to help parents understand how their children feel. By trying to give parents this understanding, the court hopes to encourage them to give better emotional support to their children.

Kids First, an educational program to assist parents, began Oct. 2 and has continued every Friday from 1-2:30 p.m. in the Jury Assembly Room at Detroit's City County Building.

"Participation is still low, about eight to 12 people a week," said Judge Kathleen MacDonald who initiated the Wayne County program with Bill Lucken, a Friend of the Court employee. "But, we eventually anticipate close to 100 people per week. So far it has gone very well, and we are pleased with the response of the parents."

MacDonald plans to schedule evening hours and suburban sessions in the near future.

About 50 percent of the court's cases are in the domestic relations category. Of these, almost 30 percent involve children who are ill-equipped to deal with such crises. The Kids First program is an expression of the strong interest of the court in helping

Some tips to keep children on track

Wayne Circuit Judge Kathleen MacDonald is moved every time she sees the "SMILE" video.

The title stands for Start Making It Liveable for Everyone and deals with divorce.

In October, MacDonald began Kids First, a program offered weekly to help divorcing parents understand the impact their divorces have on their children.

She's continually struck by a little girl in the film who reveals her feelings about her father, who doesn't pay child support.

"I feel like he's telling us to go in the corner and die," the girl said.

From a booklet called "Kids First," by Lorraine Osthaus, of Oakland County Friend of the Court, MacDonald provides tips

on how parents can help their children cope:

- Children need predictability. Children who can maintain regular routines are less likely to be overwhelmed by the changes divorce brings. Parents should do their best to build and maintain healthy and smooth environments.

- They need frequent and regular contacts with both parents, continued contact with friends and relatives of both parents and personal space to call their own, even if it is just a corner.

- Parents should exercise caution when introducing new boyfriends or girlfriends to children. Children often feel confused about their sense of loyalty, and pa-

rents' casual relationships may contribute to children's sense of insecurity and instability.

- Children need relationships with both parents. A parent needs to stress the good points about the other parent and avoid name-calling, saying bad things, or blaming the other parent for problems.

- A parent should keep family photos available, including photos of the other parent.

- A parent should allow children to express their love for the other parent and talk about their experiences with the other parent.

- If children complain about one parent, the other parent should encourage children to take the complaint to the person responsible rather than agree with the children. A parent has no control over the other parent.

- A parent should encourage the other parent's involvement in the children's school or other activities and advise of parent/teacher conferences, provide report cards and give other information pertaining to the welfare of the children.

- A parent should assist children to buy cards and gifts for the other parent.

- Parents should telephone, write, make tapes and send cards if they are not able to see their children regularly.

touching, features a discussion with family counseling experts, but MacDonald said that the real focus of the year-old video "is the very frank statements of the children who are interviewed by these persons, how they felt during the divorce, after the divorce and also how the behavior of their parents affected them."

MacDonald, a member of the Family Counseling and Mediation staff, then conducts a short question-and-answer period. The entire program is about 90 minutes long. The video features Wayne and Oakland County adults and children, MacDonald said.

Kids First is strictly for adults but not limited to the parties in the lawsuit. "All attorneys are welcome to attend the Kids First program," MacDonald said. "It would help them help their clients."

Parents should not bring their children because child care is not available on site. There is no charge to attend.

Upon completion of the Kids First program, each participant receives a certificate of attendance to present to the judge assigned to his or her case. Attendees also receive a Kids First booklet which serves as a program refresher and reference resource. The booklet is filled with explanations and tips, some of which are in the video, a Children's Bill of Rights and a directory containing information regarding other assistance available throughout Wayne County.

started three years ago by Judge Ed Sosnick and Richard Victor, a Birmingham-based attorney, MacDonald said.

Impressed by the Oakland program, the Third Judicial Circuit formed a committee to implement a similar program in Wayne County. Committee members are: Judges Kathleen MacDonald, chairman, Susan D. Borman, Pamela K. Harwood,

James J. Rashid, and K. Kent Batty, court administrator and Gerhard F. Ritsema, Friend of the Court.

Divorcing parents receive an invitation by letter to attend the program from the chief judge when they apply for a divorce. "Divorce is a time when parents and children may feel overwhelmed by the losses and changes that require each family member to adjust to a new way of living," Chief

Judge Richard C. Kaufman wrote in the letter. "The more knowledge parents have about divorce and its impact on children, the better they are able to cope."

The weekly format for the Kids First program includes an introduction and presentation by a circuit judge after which the participants view the SMILE video. The videotape, which MacDonald describes as

Water system's leaks need plugging soon

Like a leaky faucet of monumental proportions, the City of Northville's sieve-like water system continues to drain water and deplete the city's finances.

A recent auditor's report found that the system, which over the years has typically lost about 40 percent of the water pumped into it, lost 44 percent during the 1991-1992 fiscal year.

An older system like Northville's is expected to lose about 20 percent of its water, not 44. Northville pays the City of Detroit about \$190,000 for its excess water loss.

While city officials have known of the situation for years, it received little attention until last year.

The problem is obvious; the solution is more elusive. A 1991 Ayers, Lewis, Norris & May report failed to pinpoint any significant breaks, suggesting that the system of underground pipes is riddled with small leaks. But the report did list the 10 worst stretches of pipe based on the frequency of water main breaks, leaks and freezes. Repairs to all pipes on the list would cost an estimated \$840,000, and would reduce the city's annual water bill by about \$110,000 according to Ayers, Lewis.

Not all the system's problems are due to its age. Some stretches of pipe are known to be buried too shallow, which leads to freezing in the winter and more damage to the pipes.

Rather than letting pipes freeze, DPW

workers would leave a fire hydrant at the end of Dubuar Street open and allow residents served by shallow water mains to run their water through the winter, so that the running water would keep the mains from freezing. That practice alone cost \$8,000-\$10,000 annually.

Such stop-gap measures are no longer enough.

City officials have argued that in the short term, repairing the pipes will be more expensive than living with the loss. But the latest auditors' report makes it clear that the city can no longer postpone repairs.

The city's own financial straits are well-documented, and there is simply no money available to launch an extensive repair program. But the case could be made for a millage dedicated to repairing the known problem areas, similar to the recently-completed street repair program.

Given the current trend, next year's water loss likely will be worse than this year's, and the cost of installing new pipe will never grow less expensive.

Homeowner earns dismissal of city's charges

A Northville homeowner charged with violating city ordinances on property maintenance won dismissal of the charges in 35th District Court.

Allan Ingle's motion to dismiss was accepted by Judge James Garber Nov. 10. Ingle had argued that the charge against him did not represent

a safety hazard or violate his neighbors' rights.

Ingle was cited June 8 for running a business out of his home, parking a trailer in his driveway more than 72 hours, and leaving tall grass and a pile of concrete in his back yard.

The citations followed two years of complaints from neighbors that a landscaping business is being run from Ingle's home. Neighbors have

complained of cars parked in the street, and piles of dirt, wood chips and bricks in his yard.

Ingle admitted in July that his son Martin runs a lawn maintenance service, but argued that it was legal as long as he did not "sell anything from the premises."

The city's business and trailer citations were dropped that same month because Zoning Enforcement

Officer Charles Altman cited the wrong sections of the ordinance in the violation notices.

Ingle, an attorney who defended himself in the case, won dismissal of the final violation after arguing that "it is obvious that grass cannot create a fire, safety or health hazard, therefore the only basis would be if it adversely affected the property rights of

adjacent owners and occupants . . . There is no allegation that any adjacent property owner is adversely affected."

Carolyn Jereck, the city attorney assigned to the case, argued in a response to Ingle's motion that several adjacent homeowners had agreed to testify about the condition of Ingle's property. "As the court is well aware,

Mr. Ingle is the source of numerous citizens' complaints for which the City Ordinance Officer has justifiably issued appropriate violations in the past," she wrote. "This case is no exception."

Ingle was cited in November, 1990 for illegally parking a trailer in front of his house. He was found guilty and paid the resulting \$50 fine.

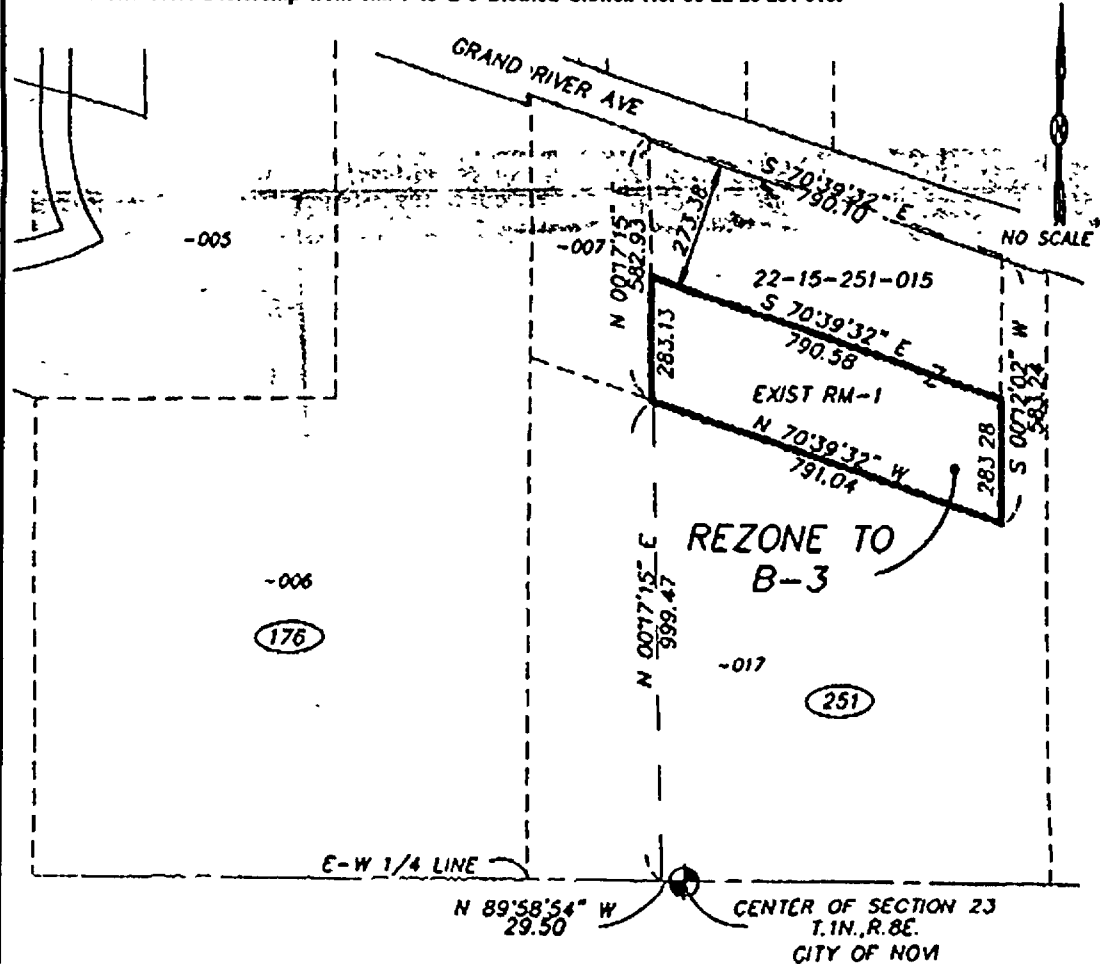

Fire Safety

Early firefighting was a competitive business

The threat of conflagration was a source of constant concern to early human communities. The use of open fires for heat, cooking and manufacturing, coupled with highly flammable building materials, presented more than ample opportunity for fire to destroy the homes and livelihoods of our ancestors.

Lacking modern firefighting equipment, most communities focused on fire prevention. Once a fire got started, there was little hope of stopping it before it destroyed at least the structure where it began. Particular efforts were made to limit the potential for large scale, uncontrolled burning of entire cities. As a reminder of these times, many cities still have laws granting the Fire Chief authority to order blocks of buildings dynamited, a method used to clear fire breaks to stop the spread of urban wildfires.

Early detection of fires, particularly at night, was another focus of early efforts to combat fires, and one of the primary func-

tions of the "night watchman." This was a principal job of the earliest known firefighting organization, the Corps of Vigiles, created in the year 6 A.D. by the Emperor Augustus. Numbering about 7,000, the Corps protected the City of Rome, patrolling the streets, fighting fires and doling out punishment to those who violated the fire prevention laws.

With the fall of Rome, organized protection entered its own dark age. Fire prevention, however, continued to be a subject of common concern. Many terms still in use today trace their origins to this period. For example, the word "curfew" comes from the Norman "couvre feu," a metal cover used to extinguish fires on the hearth at nightfall, in accordance with laws designed to prevent the risks associated with unattended fires in the home.

Homes in 12th century London were required to be equipped with ladders and "fire hooks," which were used to drag burning thatch from the roofs of houses. Fire hooks are no longer used today, but their memory survives when we talk about a "hook and ladder" truck.

Efforts at organized fire protection in what would become the United States date

back at least to 1647, when the Dutch governor of New Amsterdam formed a group of firemasters who patrolled the streets at night. They carried wooden noisemakers called "rattlers," which were used to warn the populace in the event of fire.

At about the same time, hand operated fire pumps or "engines" were being put to widespread use in Europe, and by 1679 the city of Boston had secured one and assigned a crew to operate it. Thus was formed the new world's first fire suppression department, and the hand operated fire engine would continue in use for the next 200 years.

In many American towns mutual fire societies were formed. These were groups of residents who banded together to assist each other in the event of fire, and their efforts were primarily devoted to saving valuables from member's homes. The mutual fire societies ultimately evolved into the country's first volunteer fire companies, as hand operated engines were acquired and fire suppression became the main focus of their attention.

Ben Franklin is credited with helping to organize one of the first such organizations, the Union Volunteer Fire Company in

Philadelphia, in 1752. Many other prominent Americans served in volunteer fire companies, including George Washington, John Hancock, Alexander Hamilton, Samuel Adams and Paul Revere.

Great pride was taken in membership, and in the decoration, maintenance and efficient operation of fire fighting equipment. Many fire companies were the center of social life in the neighborhood, in addition to providing protection for the public.

The volunteer companies were independent organizations, and often competed with each other for the honor of being the first to arrive and put water on the fire. In large cities, which had many companies, this competition would at times get out of hand, with fistfights breaking out between the members of rival companies.

By the mid-nineteenth century the rivalries had grown to the point where companies would sometimes deliberately place obstacles in the way of their competitors. The term "plug-ugly" comes from this time, and referred to youngsters hired to race to the scene of a fire, where they would hide the nearest fire plug under a

barrel, saving it for the arrival of their chosen company.

Violence between members of rival volunteer fire companies, the development of steam powered fire engines (which required fewer people to operate than did the hand operated engines) and the growth of cities fueled by the new immigration led to the disbanding of volunteer companies in larger American cities, and their replacement with paid, municipally employed fire fighters. The city of Cincinnati organized the first fully paid municipal fire department in 1853.

In the years following the Civil War this became the standard form of organization for fire departments in large cities. Small towns and rural areas were not plagued with the problems associated with the volunteer companies in large cities, and volunteer fire fighting organizations have remained the most common form of organization in these areas to the present day.

Moore graduated from Schoolcraft in 1970 with an associate's degree in nursing. Four years later she died of cancer. "I really miss Eileen," the anonymous donor said. "She was the best buddy I ever had."

The donor, who is very much alive, also asked Schoolcraft not to reveal the amount of money given for the endowment.

Other people, like Garden City resident Jerry Young, who died in 1984, start Schoolcraft endowments by naming the college in their wills.

A Chrysler tool and die worker for more than 30 years, Young was widowed in retirement and had no children to leave his money to.

So in his will Young left \$65,000 to Schoolcraft to establish a \$50,000 technology scholarship endowment, an \$8,000 endowment to fund senior citizen programs and a \$7,000 endowment to pay for widow and widower programs (like grief seminars).

Not all scholarships are paid for with endowments, however. Schoolcraft also has something called "trustee scholarships," paid for out of the college's general fund.

These \$800-a-year renewable scholarships are reserved for students graduating from Plymouth Canton, Plymouth Salem, Churchill, Stevenson, Franklin, Garden City, Northville and Clarencville high schools. Five scholarships are issued to each school. (The college board of trustees is currently considering adding more trustee scholarships, perhaps as many as 10 per school.)

Applications to receive Schoolcraft scholarships will not be accepted until May, Florek said, but donations to establish new endowments will be cheerfully received any time.

taught by one less teacher than the 1991-92 class profiles. At the elementary level, the average class size is 29.25. That equates to 3.03 more students per teacher with four less teachers and 71 more students in the three schools.

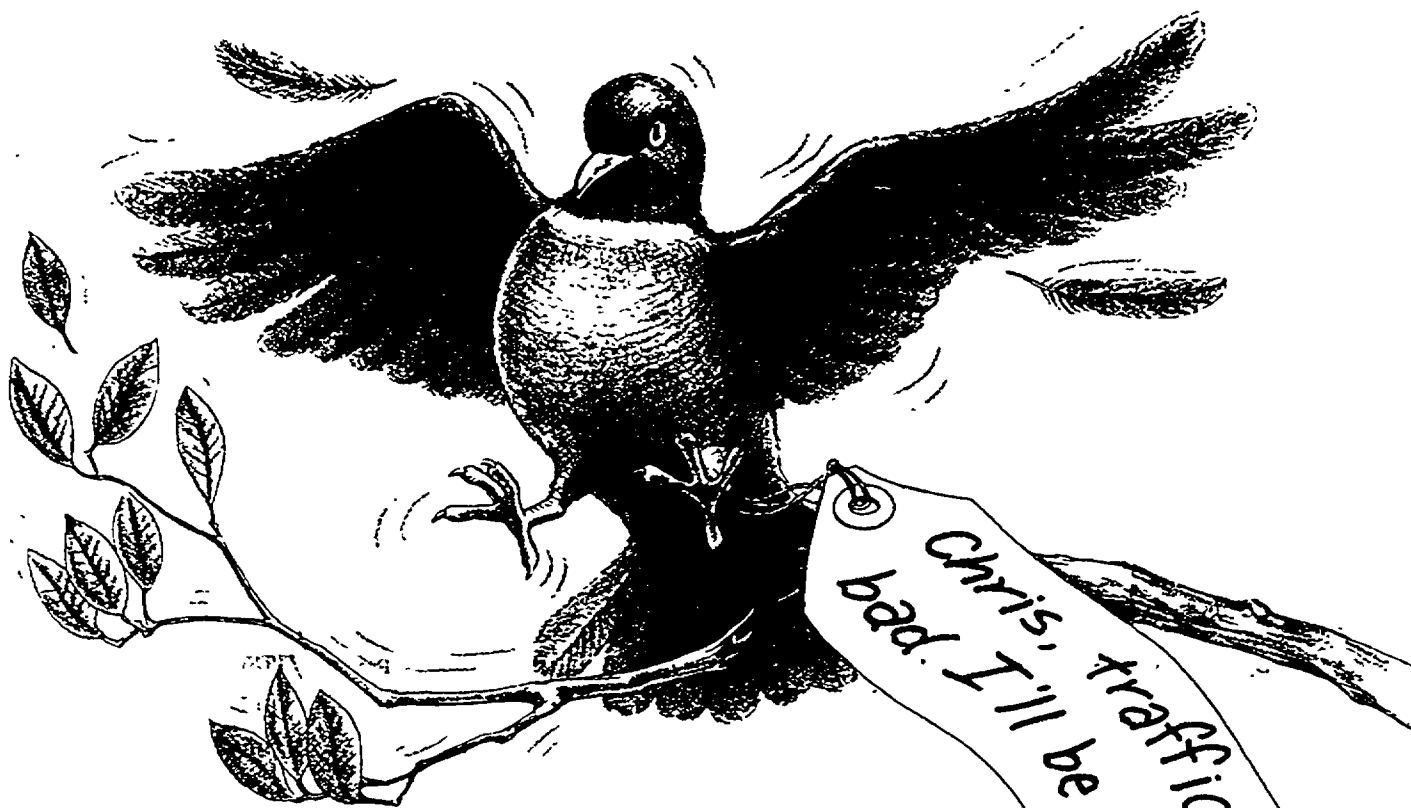
There are similar statistics for the two middle schools. With an average class of 31.75 students, Meads Mill and Cooke Middle schools are bursting at their seams. They've collectively taken on 32 more students this year with 3.5 fewer teachers. At the high school the average class size is 31.47, a jump of 4.5 more students per class than last year. Even though the school has taken in only one regular education student, it's lost 7.3 teachers.

Fourth Friday counts indicate student enrollment jumped by 120 students this year. There are 4,141 total regular education students and 11 special education students enrolled in Northville this year. To add insult to injury, because of the June millage defeat, there are 16.7 fewer instructors teaching in the district this year.

And if demographic projections made by the Stanford Institution in Lansing are even close to accurate, the district could see the similar enrollment increases in the 1993-94 school year. Stanford has predicted the district would take in an additional 130 students next year.

After hearing his report board member Jean Hansen offered her comment.

"These are not figures we are proud of. They hurt us," she said.

Cutting the fat calls for new ingredient lists

If a muffin weighs heavy in your hand, and has a sticky surface, it is likely to have as many calories and as much fat as a cupcake or doughnut.

Many bakery or deli muffins have more hydrogenated oil, sugar and eggs than oat or wheat bran. A sign of a high fat content is a dense and moist product, like a baked carrot cake or banana bread. If you change, modify or clean up your recipes this need not happen. Food can still be delicious if the fat, sugar and salt are reduced in favorite recipes.

To reduce sodium in your diet or recipes be on the look out for: baking powder, baking soda, soy sauce, brine, garlic salt, onion salt, monosodium glutamate (MSG), sea salt, sodium chloride (table salt), sodium citrate, sodium nitrate, sodium phosphate and sodium saccharin.

Read the labels on packaged foods. In most home recipes cut the amount of salt in half, the exception would be yeast bread. You will soon adjust to the less salty flavor.

Instead of using salt, substitute herbs, spices, lemon or lime juice or a combination of these. Some herbs and spices to consider are dill, oregano, basil, rosemary, thyme, cumin, chili powder, curry powder, and paprika.

Ketchup and mustard are virtually fat free but are high in sodium. Make your own mustard by using dry mustard powder, add milk, vinegar or water and mix to desired consistency.

To decrease saturated fat and cholesterol, use vegetable oils instead of solid fat. Use about one-fourth less oil than the recipe calls for. Substitute apple sauce in equal amounts for the oil in a cake, brownie or muffin mix.

Most standard recipes call for more sugar, salt and fat than necessary. Use half the amount of sugar called for in baked goods and desserts. Every one-fourth cup of brown or white sugar adds nearly 200 empty calories. This lesser amount of sugar is best for quick breads, cookies, pie filling, custard pudding and fruit crisps.

Increase the amount of vanilla or cinnamon for recipes that you have decreased the sugar. This will give the impression of sweetness. Eliminate additional calories by replacing frosting with just a light dusting of powdered sugar.

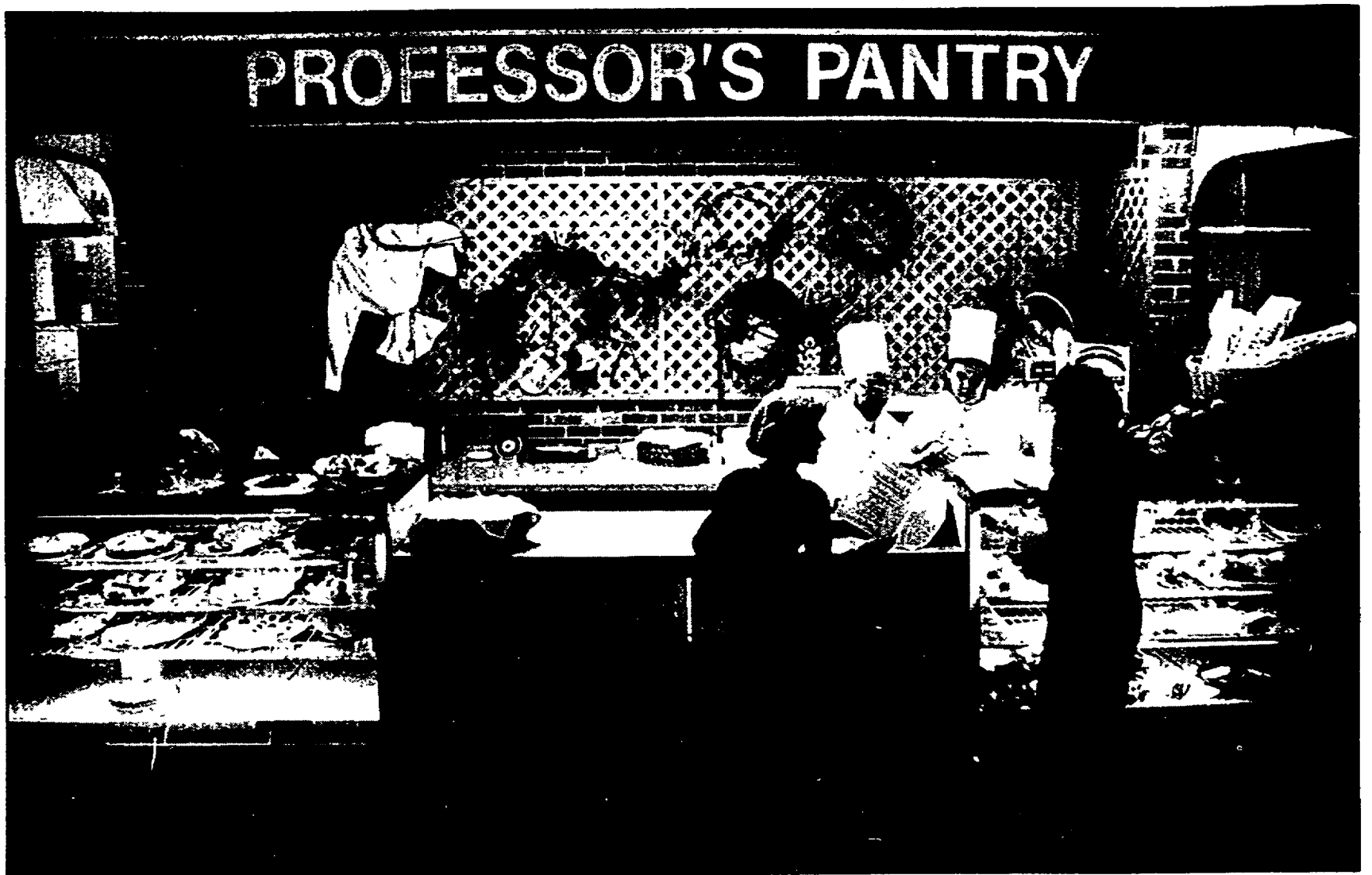
Choose and cook meat the low-fat way. The leanest beef is: top round, eye of the round, round tip, sirloin, top loin and tenderloin. These cuts of meat can be made tender by marinating them in an acid-base liquid such as vinegar, citrus juice, tomato juice or wine.

Most salad dressings, creamy or oily, get 90 percent of their calories from fat. However they may also contain eggs, cream and cheese. Make your own dressing to avoid the fat. When making a vinaigrette use less oil and more vinegar.

For a new flavor in a palatable low-oil dressing, use a flavorful walnut oil and a mild balsamer or rice vinegar, add a little garlic, a few herbs, and Dijon mustard. You'll be amazed over the delightful creamy dressing you can make from plain non-fat yogurt, onion, dill, oregano or basil and pepper. Mayonnaise is about 100 percent fat with little cholesterol. A better choice would be to make your own version by diluting a low-fat or light mayonnaise with non-fat yogurt, lemon juice or vinegar.

For good health reasons, maybe you'd like to consider a semi-vegetarian diet. This is a diet of fresh vegetables, grains, legumes, fresh fruit and dairy products with an occasional moderate serving of beef, poultry or fish. Generally four ounces of uncooked trimmed meat without bone will yield three ounces of cooked meat. A three-ounce cooked serving is about the size of a deck of playing cards.

Healthy eating does not mean boring or unappealing. Clean up your recipes by reducing the fat, sugar and salt in them, and reduce the fatty foods you choose. You'll feel better and it certainly will be better for you.

CHEF'S SECRET

College's retail store emphasizes quality

A lot of people don't know that we have one of the finest culinary arts schools in the country right here in our midst.

Schoolcraft College consistently is rated among America's top culinary arts programs. But few people know that they can put some of the best the school has to offer right on their own dinner tables tonight.

They're the ones who've never tried to purchase anything from The Professor's Pantry, the retail outlet for the items created by students in Schoolcraft's program.

The "professor" behind the Professor's Pantry is Chef Sylvia Hayes. She presented the idea several years ago when she was about to graduate from the culinary arts school herself. She was hired soon after, and the Professor's Pantry has been hers ever since.

"In my opinion, it's the best kept secret in town," says Chef Hayes. "People who come here like the service. The products are prepared daily, and there is a variety of items to choose from. Of course, the standard of the department as a whole is to provide the finest products we can. That's the thing we emphasize, is that these are quality products."

Creation of a retail outlet was a natural for Schoolcraft's culinary arts department. With all the work students did in the kitchen, there was a lot of fine food being made, and the school cafeteria couldn't handle it all.

On any given day, students turn out products from butchering, charcuterie (sausages and their like), baking, pastry-making and catering classes.

"This gave the students, staff and the community a chance to purchase food through the culinary arts department," says Chef Hayes. "We started on the cafeteria line, and then moved to our own counter."

Nowadays the bulk of the customers cooing

and aching over the glass cases at the Professor's Pantry come from the adjacent office buildings.

"We use the money we make to buy new things," Chef Hayes says.

You probably shouldn't go to the Professor's Pantry expecting to find a bargain. You won't find discount prices here. But then, where else can you find exquisitely prepared cakes and pies that will make your family and guests want to take pictures?

And we dare say you won't find better tasting sausages, smoked meats and fates anywhere in Southeast Michigan than the ones at the Professor's Pantry. They're ground, prepared and smoked right in the kitchen under the direction of Schoolcraft's chefs and instructors. Fresh breads and rolls come fresh from the oven, too.

The pricing, says Chef Hayes, is competitive, and most items are actually less expensive than you might pay in a store for gourmet-quality products. Sound business and marketing practices are, after all, part of the lesson that students are supposed to learn while working at the Professor's Pantry. And lesson one is that quality costs.

"It's an instructional aspect of the program," Hayes says. "It teaches them retail and marketing skills."

Jennifer Crist, a student working at the Professor's Pantry points out, "It teaches us customer relations, too."

Says Chef Hayes, "They learn to deal with the various holidays, running specials and setting up platters. They learn which products are marketable."

Crist, a second-year student from Livonia, has formed her own opinions on that during her stint behind the counter.

"We had a banana torte last week that was awesome," she says. "Pastries. That's what I really want to go into. But then, that changes ev-

Closing of butcher shop marks end of an era



Last Sunday I called Aunt Betty in Buffalo to chat and check up on everyone's well being. We always end up talking more about food than anything else.

On this occasion, I had phoned to say that my cousin John and his new wife, Joan, had been in for dinner the previous evening. To have visitors from Buffalo without a wedding is a big deal for us. Joan's brother lives in Sterling Heights so

hopefully we will see them in this neck of the woods more often.

Just by chance my parents and two sisters were also eating so we had a fine family reunion. A great time was had by all.

But, back to the phone call. Aunt Betty informed me that Puehn's Meat Market was closing its doors Saturday, going out of business.

You may recall, in a column this summer, I wrote about my Uncle George and Aunt Georgia. Until two days ago they were the proprietors of this market. Grandpa Puehn started the business 70 years ago and Uncle George made a career of butchering.

He raised a family of seven on his "draw," working excruciatingly long hours. Butchering is not easy and is an art

that is becoming lost to our generation. Now it consists of breaking down quarters or parts of the carcass versus the whole thing. There is little specialty work required. When is the last time you asked your butcher to do something special for you? We just don't anymore.

Instead, we'll go to a huge, giant market that sells everything from diapers to beer and pick up whatever steak or chicken happens to be in the counter at the time.

Our demand for quality has diminished drastically. We are much too accepting. Granted, time is a factor. It is hard to make 10 strips instead of one. So, we'll sacrifice quality and taste for convenience. It's a shame.

For the last few years my aunt and

uncle have struggled to keep the business viable. My Aunt Georgia makes the most incredible soups in the world. Really, really, good, earthy, fantastic soups.

Her turkey sausage is the best I've ever tasted. There are no preservatives or nitrates. Only fresh ground turkey meat, sans fat and other body parts that sometimes find their way into the store product. Her way is much more expensive but she only made what she'd feed to her family. That's one of the differences between a giant super and a small shop. I'm lucky. I've got the recipe and sometime soon will venture into sausage making.

Visiting their shop was a treat, one of the highlights of a Buffalo trip. "Here try this." "Take some spaghetti sauce to your

grandmother." "How much bacon do want to take home?" and all the while, customers coming and going.

Some have been regulars for decades. Others are sons, daughters or grandchildren of the forerunners. Names are used. There is no need for taking a number. These are patrons they have known for eons. There is mutual respect.

But no longer. Uncle George will go to work for a friend. Aunt Georgia will close up the shop, getting ready for a new tenant. They will be sad. It would be impossible not to be. Their lives have been devoted to an honorable and respectable profession. I'm very proud of them and their dedication and feel sorrow for the end of an era that can never return.

ery time I get into a different class rotation."

Chef Hayes says that, like any good college, Schoolcraft wants to turn out a well-rounded graduate, not just another good chef.

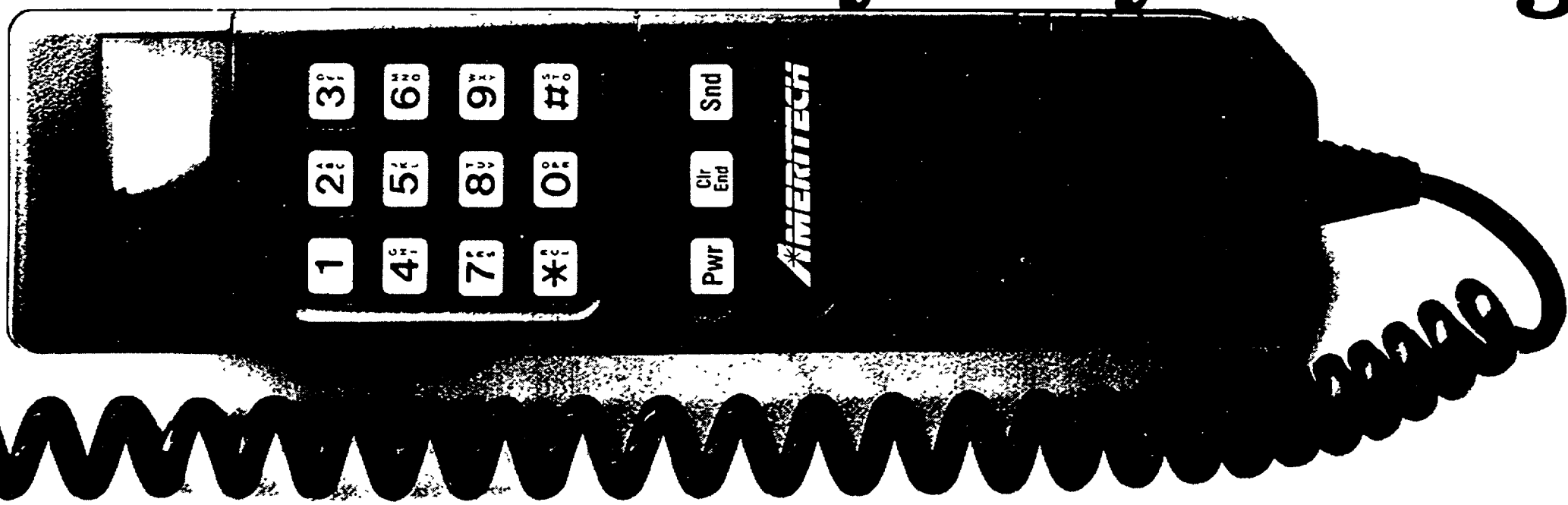

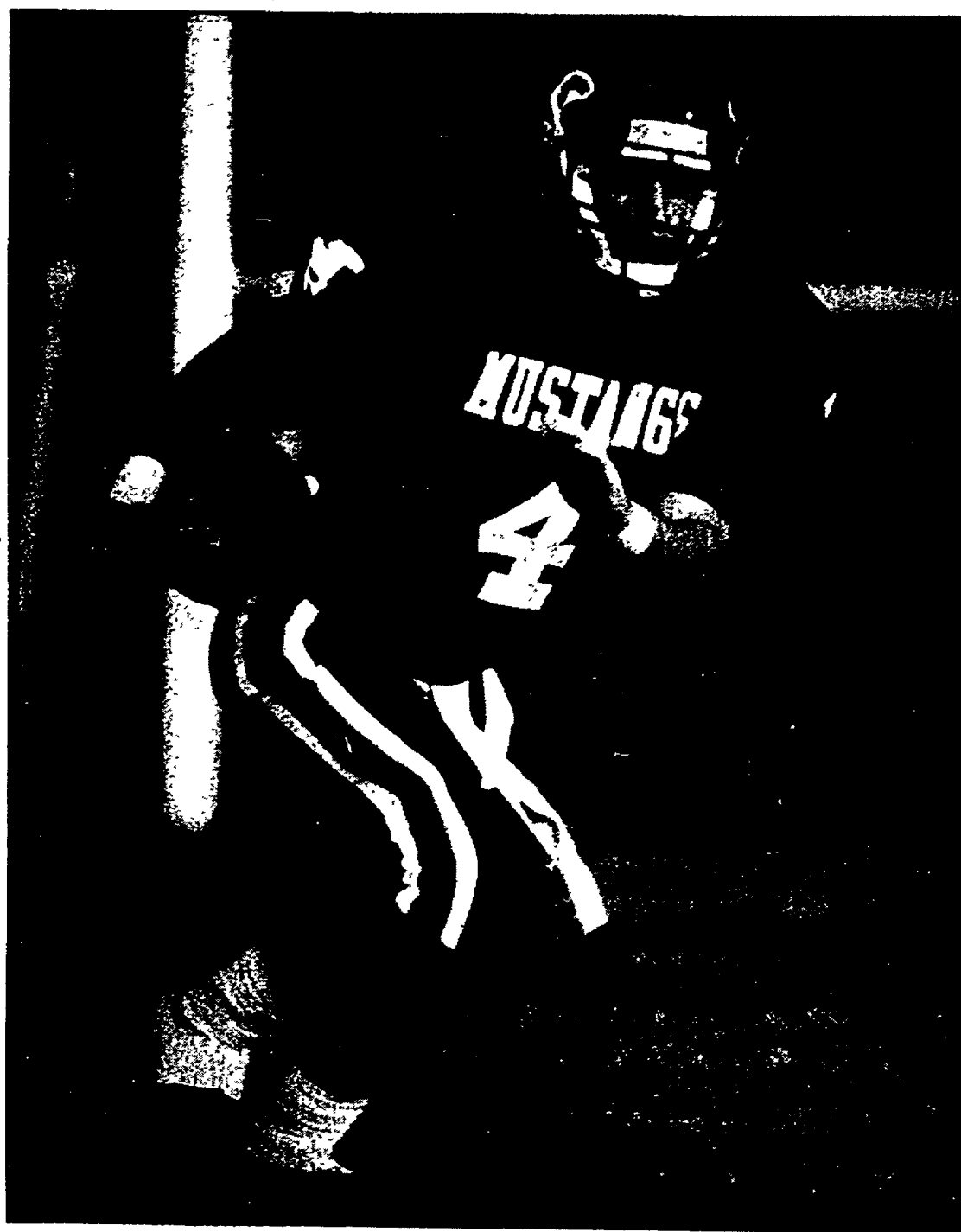

Gridders make playoffs, place third in WLAA

The following is a game-by-game recap of NHS football team's 1992 campaign. Northville finished the year at 6-3 (regular season) and in second place in the Western Division of the WLAA. The Mustangs made it to the first round of the state playoffs, but fell to Walled Lake Western. Thursday's Northville Record will name the 1992 All-Area squads. An outlook on 1993's Northville Mustangs will also be presented.

SOUTH LYON 34, NORTHVILLE 6: The Mustangs were never in the season opener on Sept. 4. The Lions led 20-0 at halftime and never looked back.

The eventual Kensington Valley Conference champs were led by running star Billy Porter. He ran for 241 yards and three touchdowns.

Quarterback Danny Walsh got the Mustangs' only score on an eight-yard keeper in the third quarter.

NORTHVILLE 35, WALLED LAKE CENTRAL 34: Linebacker Bryan Kelley was the hero for Northville's first victory of 1992. He intercepted a pass in the Mustang end zone and raced 103 yards for the winning touchdown in the final minutes of the game.

Central had a chance to win the game with seconds left. After scoring to cut the lead to 35-34, the Vikings elected to try for two points and the win. But Walled Lake fumbled and Nick Bowersox recovered to seal the victory.

Fullback Rob Subotich ran for 78 yards in the game and Walsh had a pair of TD passes.

NORTHVILLE 31, LIVONIA CHURCHILL 0: The Mustangs literally ran over the Chargers for their first home win. Kevin Shaw, Subotich and Marc Golden com-

bined for more than 200 yards on the ground en route to the blowout.

Defensive end John Gatti played his best game of the season. He had a pair of quarterback sacks and a total of six tackles for losses.

The entire defense was outstanding, holding Livonia to just 71 yards of total offense. Northville led 14-0 at halftime.

NORTHVILLE 20, PLYMOUTH-CANTON 13: A pair of third quarter Walsh touchdowns led the Mustangs to victory over the Chiefs on the road Sept. 25.

Canton led 13-7 at halftime. But Walsh rallied the Mustangs on runs of 11 yards and 1 yard in the third quarter. Northville held Canton scoreless in the second half.

The Chiefs moved to the Mustangs' 6-yard line late in the fourth quarter. An illegal pass helped stall the drive and Northville took over on downs.

NORTHVILLE 19, LIVONIA FRANKLIN 14: Walsh dominated the first game of October to propel the Mustangs to a division showdown with Walled Lake Western.

Walsh threw and ran for touchdowns against the Patriots. He also returned a kickoff 90 yards for another score.

"Special teams won the game," coach Darrel Schumacher said. Livonia outgained Northville 266 yards to 142.

WALLED LAKE WESTERN 30, NORTHVILLE 27: The Mustangs went for the Western Division championship on Oct. 9 and gave a valiant effort before losing in overtime.

Northville led 17-7 at halftime. But Western runner Arnie Gillert was too much to handle in the second half. He ran for 284 yards in the game.

Gillert scored on the opening

drive of the third period. But Walsh countered with a 98-yard kickoff return for a TD. Walled Lake score 10 in the fourth quarter to tie.

In the overtime period, Northville took the ball first, and got a 41-yard Mike Hirvala field goal to take the lead. But Gillert found the end zone to give the Warriors the win on their OT possession.

NORTHVILLE 24, FARMINGTON HILLS HARRISON 21: The Mustangs rebounded on the road as Hirvala connected on a 36-yard field goal with less than six minutes remaining. It was Northville's first win ever over the Hawks.

Northville led 14-13 at halftime on Walsh and Shaw touchdowns. The Mustangs then added a third quarter score to set up Hirvala's game winner.

NORTHVILLE 14, NORTH FARMINGTON 13: Shaw preserved the Mustang victory by deflecting a two-point conversion try by the Raiders.

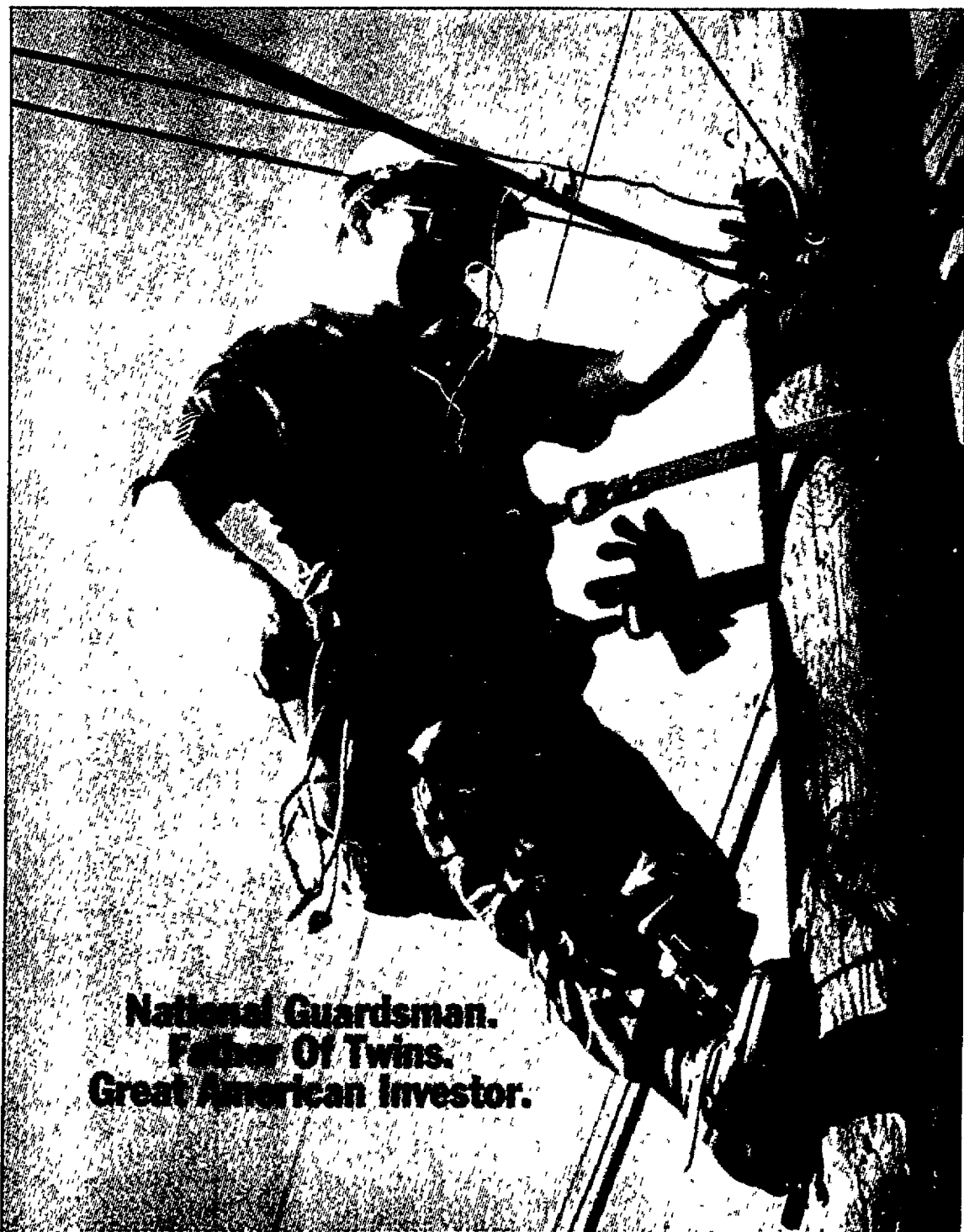
The crossover win finished Northville's WLAA season and left them third overall — their best finish ever. As it turned out, it sealed the Mustangs' spot in the state playoffs.

NOVI 32, NORTHVILLE 28: The Wildcats took the Baseline Jug for the first time with a dramatic fourth quarter rally.

Novi's John Lahti scored with 22 seconds left to seal the deal. The Wildcats trailed 28-20 at the start of the fourth quarter.

WALLED LAKE WESTERN 23, NORTHVILLE 6: The Mustangs were dominated by the Warriors in the first round of the state playoffs.

Northville did little offensively except for one series in the fourth quarter when Golden hit Jason Holman for a TD pass. Gillert had his way with the Mustang defense again as he rushed for more than 200 yards.

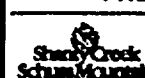

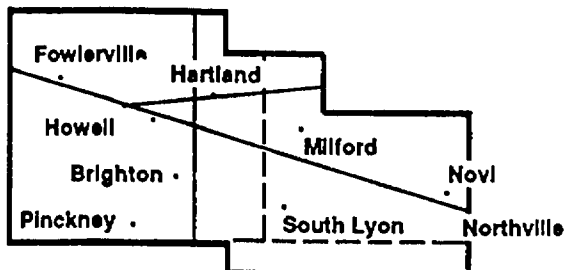

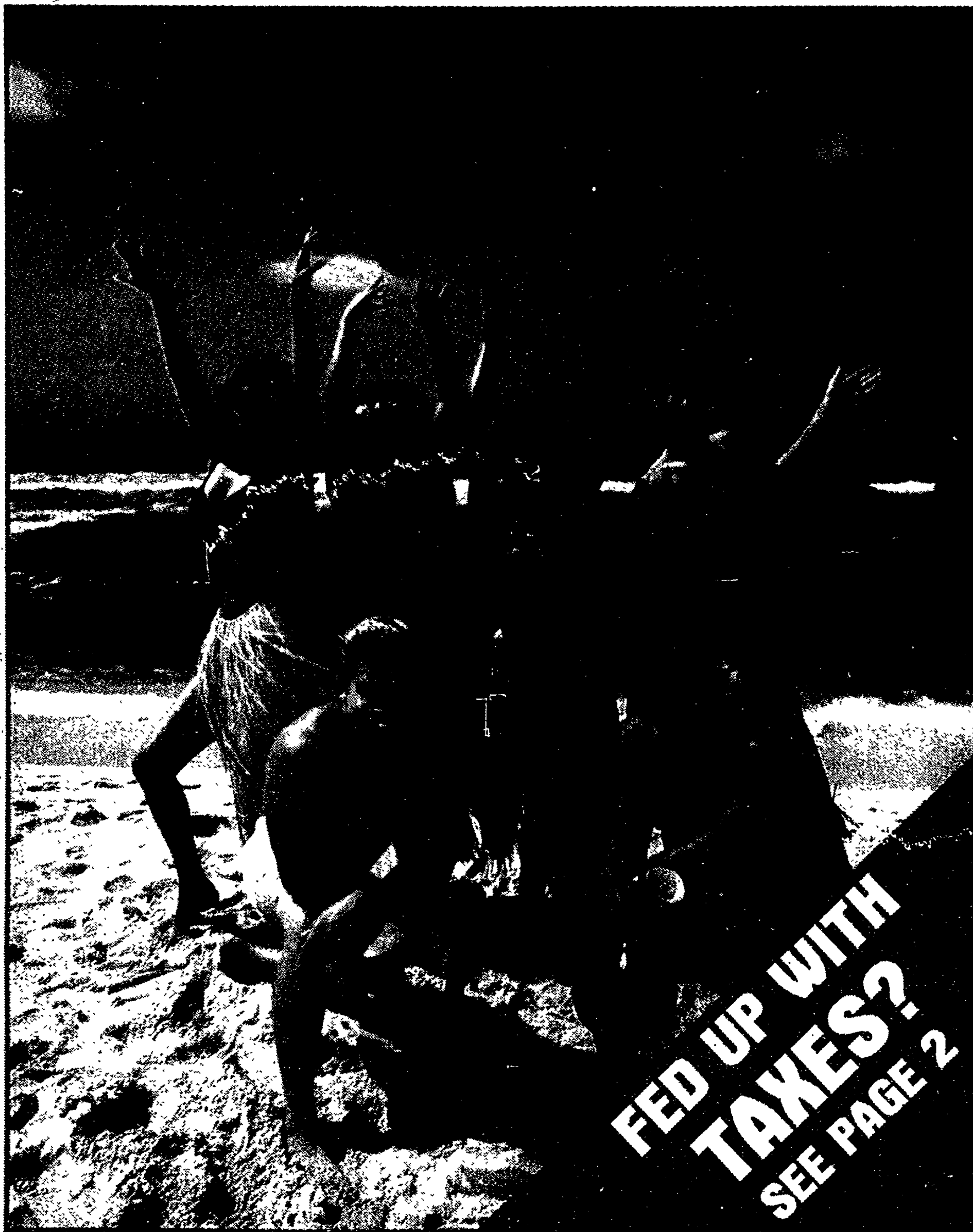

Saturday morning hit gets prime-time shot

The cast of NBC's *Saved by the Bell*, the top-rated Saturday-morning series for teens, has been rewarded by the network with a working vacation in the tropics. The prime-time movie *Saved by the Bell Hawaiian Style*, airing Friday, Nov. 27, also treated the young cast to the influential presence of former Disney leading man Dean Jones.

Kelly falls for a young lawyer with ulterior motives. Slater (Mario Lopez) and Jesse (Elizabeth Berkley) discover even a lovers' paradise can be ruined by petty bickering. Meanwhile, Lisa (Lark Voorhies) finds some new malls to shop at and Screech (Dustin Diamond)...well, Screech has his video camera.

The first prime-time outing for *Saved by the Bell* is not going to win any new viewers outside its original demographic group—adults, for example—but it won't disappoint any fans in its stretch from a half-hour to two hours. Never mind that a subplot in which Screech's resemblance to a carved statue causing natives to believe he is the descendant of their tribal god is all too similar to an episode of *Gilligan's Island*.

Jones, known for his roles in *Bee-*

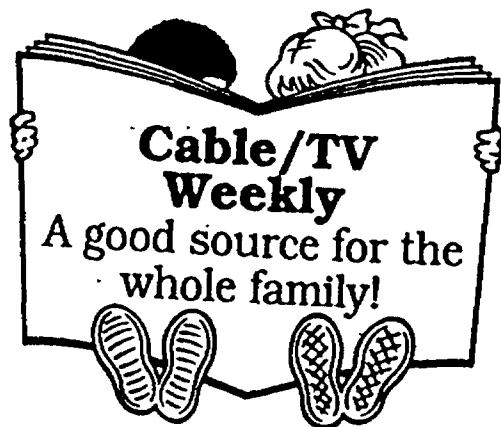
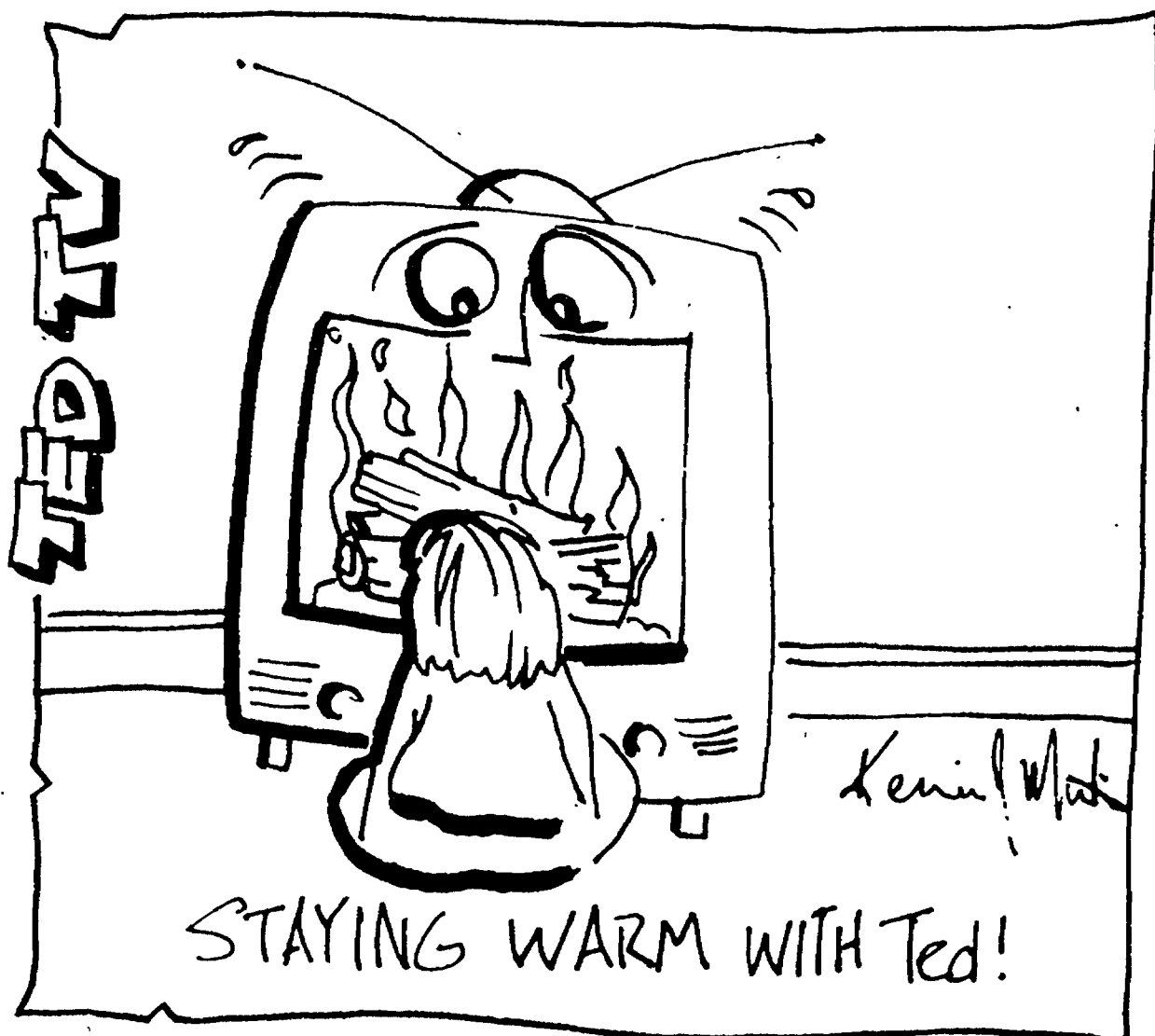

Extensively involved with child-care organizations, Jones enjoyed the time spent on the *Saved by the Bell* project.

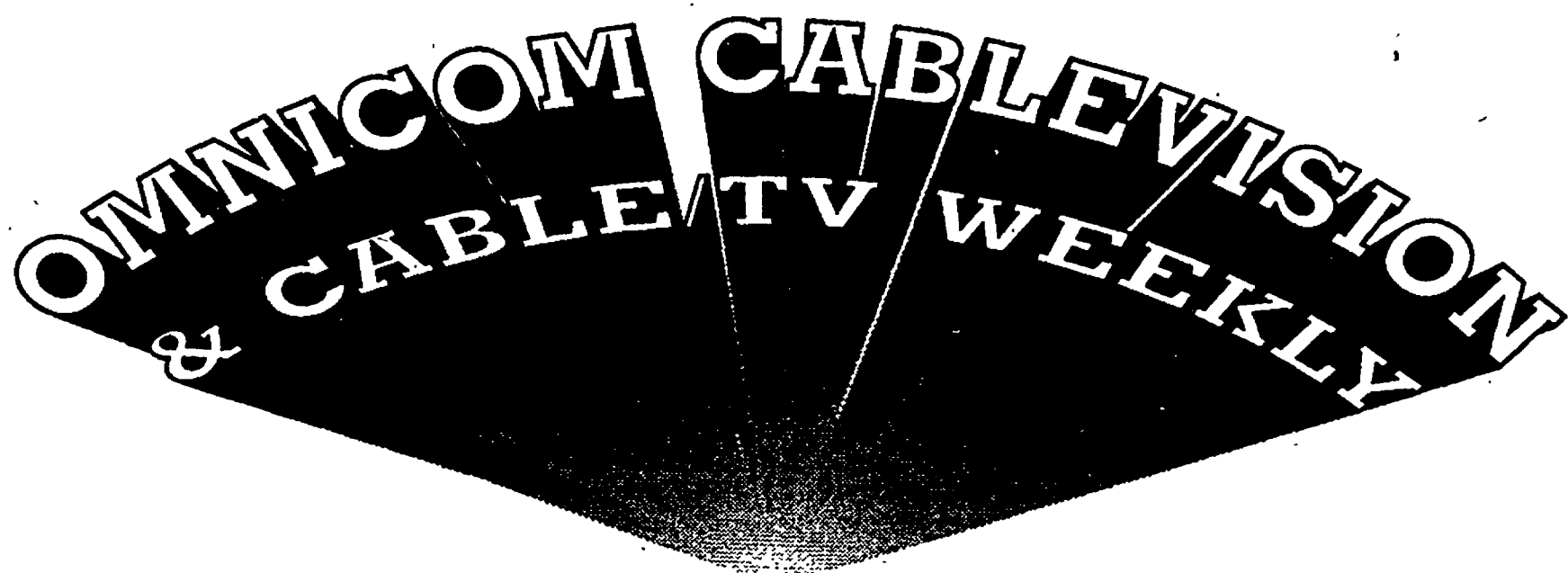

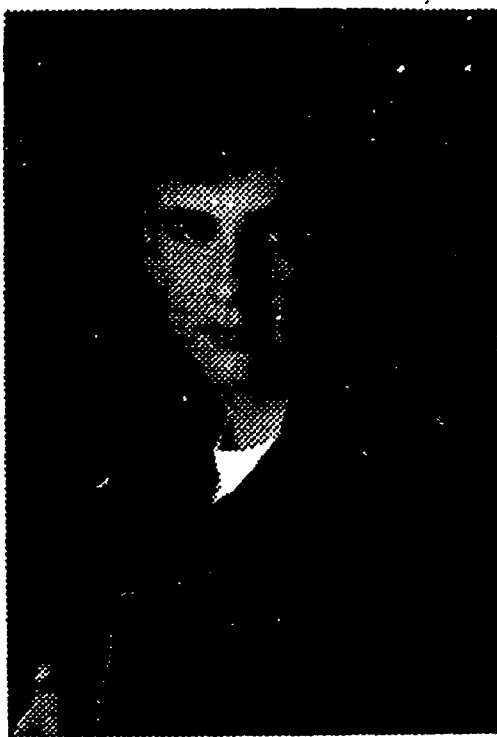

"I will never forget the moment," says director Ivan Passer, "the first day of shooting in Russia, when Mr. Duvall came out of the makeup trailer made up as Stalin." Duvall, who has the title role in HBO's three-hour film *Stalin*, also recalls that day, when he emerged after four hours of wig fitting, nose plastering and eyebrow painting. But Passer, who grew up in Czechoslovakia during the Stalinist era, says the effect was worth it.

"We had about 80 soldiers — extras, Russians, dressed up as soldiers — and about 60 people in the crew, and they just froze. And he walked through them and they couldn't look at him, they looked down and they parted so that he could go through, and they stopped talking. I got the chills."

Passer also notes that Duvall stayed in character between takes, which must have been a fine way to maintain discipline on the set.

One good turn deserves another. Fashion critic Mr. Blackwell will play himself in a talk-show sequence on an upcoming episode of ABC's *Civil Wars* title "The Triumph of DeVille." Blackwell recently granted series star Mariel Hemingway a place on his annual Best Dressed list and has apparently earned a reward.

'Planeteers' defeat unfounded fears

Clearing the globe of environmental evil might be their full-time jobs, but the eco-warriors of *Captain Planet and the Planeteers* work overtime in a new episode airing in syndication on Saturday, Nov. 21, and the following day on the Planeteers' base station, TBS.

"A Formula for Hate," wherein the Planeteers purge polluted minds in lieu of the usual lakes and streams, is the first cartoon to deal squarely with the issue of AIDS.

The show features the voice work of Elizabeth Taylor as Donna, a mother who learns her popular, athletic child is HIV-positive and the object of a citywide hate campaign.

Taylor's own family has been directly touched by the disease, and even through a Southern drawl obviously thickened for effect, heartfelt pain and indignation are effectively emoted. Other guest voices include Neil Patrick Harris (*Doogie Howser, M.D.*), as Donna's afflicted high-school son Todd, and Danica McKellar (Winnie, *The Wonder Years*), as his unwavering girlfriend.

Surprisingly few stones remain unturned in this episode's path to better understanding, especially considering its animation. But as loyal Planeteers and their parents can attest, this is what *Captain Planet* creator Ted Turner envisioned, a cartoon with a conscience.

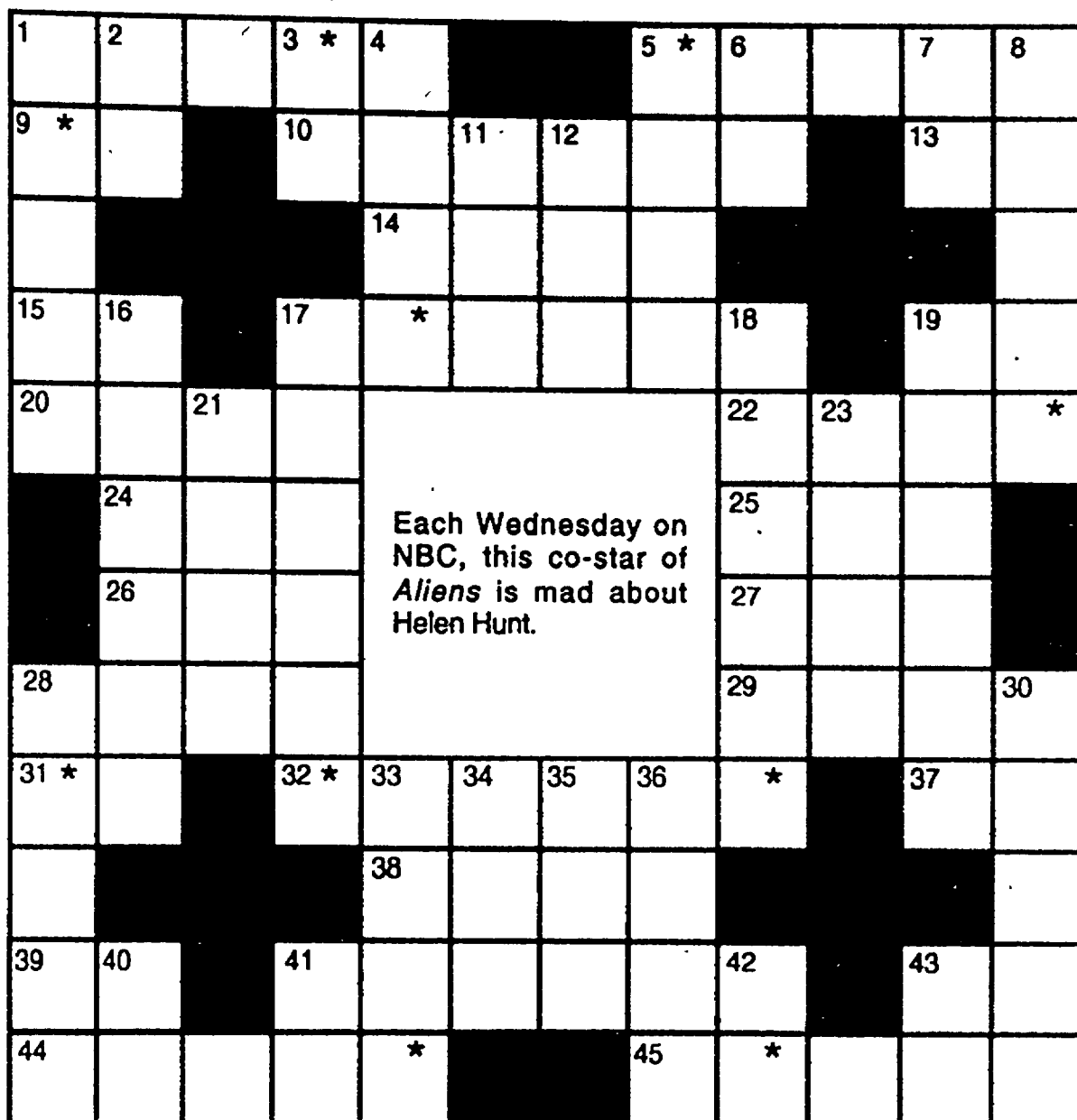

Three Gabors, dah-ling; Swayze not a dad

Q: We are really curious about the Gabor sisters. How many of them are there, and what are their ages and names? Also, is Eva the youngest and does she pronounce her name "A"-va? —Phil Richards, Portland, Ore.

A: There are three Gabor sisters, Zsa Zsa (born Sari), Eva (indeed pronounced with the long "a" sound) and Magda. Zsa Zsa, the eldest of the three Budapest, Hungary, natives, was born on Feb. 6, 1921 and married eight times. The star of films including *Moulin Rouge* and *Queen of Outer Space*, she was once convicted of slapping a policeman. Eva, the youngest sister, chirped "Ah-lee-vah!" on TV's *Green Acres*, was born on Feb. 11, 1924, and has had five husbands. Magda's birthday is not widely known, since she has not pursued a screen career.

Q: Will you please tell me what you know about an actress from the '30s and '40s named Beulah Bondi?

A: She was cast as the mother of the hero in many classic films. Two of my favorites were Bondi as Gary Cooper's mother in *Sergeant York* and as James Stewart's mother in *It's a Wonderful Life*. —Barbara Sudheimer, Kihei, Hawaii.

A: Beulah Bondi (originally Bondy) was born on May 3, 1892, in Chicago. She had appeared in small stage productions even before the turn of the century, and her acting talent would be relegated to stock theater for 25 more years before she won a major Broadway role in *One of the Family*. Five years later, she appeared in her first film, *Street Scene*, at age 39. The remainder of her career was spent in mature characterizations.

Topping the list of her long and illustrious film roles are her two Oscar-nominated performances, for 1936's *The Gorgeous Hussy* and 1938's *Of Human Hearts*.

Bondi also won an Emmy in 1977 for Outstanding Lead Actress for a Single Appearance in a Drama or Comedy Series for "The Pony Cart" episode of *The Waltons*, portraying a dying, reclusive Walton who touches the lives of the 'mountain family before she

passes away. Bondi never married; she died in 1981.

Q: Can you tell me if Patrick Swayze and his wife have any children? I say "yes" and my friend says "no." Who is right? —Sharon Gallagher, Portland, Ore.

A: Just saying "no" seems to pay off in many ways, and this is one of them. Sorry, Swayze and his wife, Lisa Niemi (see 'em both in *Steel Dawn*), have no children.

Q: Several years ago we saw a great movie on television and have never seen it again. The wife is an absent-minded person who can't get through a normal day without reminders and written notes from her husband. They relocate, and she must travel alone to the new city where they will be living in the family station wagon. She forgets to fill the tank, and she witnesses a robbery and murder when she finally stops for gas, and afterwards she is chased cross-country. What is the name of this movie, and is it available on video? —Carol Gerue, Stephenson, Mich.

A: The frightfully forgetful character was played by Valerie Harper, and the movie of which you write is *Night Terror*, a 1976 made-for-television effort co-starring Richard Romanus, Michael Tolan, Quinn Cummings and Nicholas Pryor. *Video Hound's* reference book says it's available on both VHS and Beta tapes.

Baseball's expansion teams go to market

Dennis Burlingame and Jim Poole aren't household names, but to the Florida Marlins and the Colorado Rockies, they may spell future success. Burlingame and Poole are among the big league prospects expected to be selected during ESPN's exclusive six-and-a-half hour coverage of Major League Baseball's expansion draft, airing live Tuesday, Nov. 17, from New York.

"Nothing like this has ever been shown before on television," says Keith Olberman, who will anchor ESPN's coverage with assistance from Peter Gammons, Ray Knight and a host of floor and field reporters.

During the draft, owners of the two expansion teams will put their scouting ability to the test when they select 36 players each from the unprotected lists of the 26 existing major league teams, who are allowed to protect just 15 of their major and minor league players.

Simple? Hardly. Some of the rules behind the draft read like a superpower arms treaty. Existing teams have been preparing for this day since the rules were spelled out over a year ago, and the draft-day wheeling and dealing as teams scramble to protect their young prospects and established stars should be interesting, to say the least.

"There will be an element of the three-ring circus here, but I really think that will make for some great television," says Olberman.
