

Group may help save woodlands

A rare stand of trees faces an uncertain future in Northville and may be lost if special protection measures are not enacted.

A 25-acre plot of native Michigan hardwoods is threatened by possible development of the Wayne County property in southern Northville Township.

The dense forest — which features walnut, sugar maple, black cherry, and beech trees — lies near a soccer and baseball field complex just west of Sheldon Road north of Five Mile.

According to conceptual plans served up by a would-be developer, the forest sits in the middle of a proposed golf course fairway.

A township official recently took steps to protect the plot, and has

asked the new township board for support.

Richard Allen, a former township trustee and planning commissioner, has contacted a Michigan chapter of The Nature Conservancy, seeking environmental asylum for the parcel he termed "an excellent example of native Michigan hardwoods in all their splendor."

Allen asked The Nature Conservancy to step in because the township's woodlands ordinance is ill-equipped to preserve the trees. Under the ordinance, developers are encouraged to save desirable trees, but may follow a graduated tree-replacement plan if construction calls for tree removal.

"I would like to encourage The Nature Conservancy to try to either

Civic Concern seeks some help

'Tis the season to be charitable, and a Northville relief organization is seeking help for the holidays.

Civic Concern Director Marlene Kunz said her agency needs food and funds to serve its growing clientele, and she wants to find families willing to "adopt" clients and senior citizens for Christmas.

Adoptive families can participate in the "Adopt-a-Family" program in a variety of ways, from sharing a holiday meal with a needy family to providing gifts and/or a Christmas tree. Toys can also be donated directly to Civic Concern, at its 215 W. Cady St. office.

"Our goal is that all of our people are adopted for the holidays, that nobody goes without a special Christmas," Kunz said. "We're not just talking about any child without a Christmas; we're talking about any family without a Christmas."

The agency currently provides emergency food, clothing, medical, housing and utility assistance to 60-80 needy families in Northville,

Novi, Livonia, Farmington and Farmington Hills. An additional 45 senior citizens are served through the state's Focus: Hope program.

Civic Concern is in constant need of food supplies and funds to buy food. Needed items include cereals, canned tuna, peanut butter and jelly, fruits and vegetables, hygiene products including shampoos, toothpaste and toothbrushes, toilet paper, baby food and diapers. Gift certificates for meats are also greatly appreciated.

But the agency does have an adequate supply of donated clothing already, Kunz said.

"We're getting enough mittens and all the things that go along with that," she said.

The Senior Center building where Civic Concern is located is also in need of a vacuum cleaner, Kunz said.

School Board to OK contracts

Northville school administrators' contracts remain unsigned five months after negotiations ended.

That's a situation the School Board hopes to rectify at its meeting tonight at 7:30 p.m. at Winchester Elementary.

Twenty contracts employing seven central office administrators, 10 building principals and their assis-

stants, and three supervisors were never signed and validated by the School Board president after they were settled last spring. Moreover, contracts for the central office staffers have never been formally approved and adopted by the Board of Education.

They are expected to be adopted tonight.

Parents go back to school for half day of shadowing

For Linda Jones, shadowing daughter Brianna for the afternoon session put to rest her fears that her two children would have a hard time adjusting to the move the family made from California last spring.

"The transition into school was really easy for them," Jones said. "That has to say something for the admini-

nistration here. I was really worried, because she was in elementary school in California and when we left we knew she'd be in junior high in a new school."

Jones also has a son who started at Amerman Elementary this year. She didn't seem bothered by the record high class sizes here in Northville because she said her children came from a district where class sizes

were considerably larger than what she has seen here.

"Class sizes are smaller here, and that helps for learning," she said.

Of the 109 parents who attended last week, 36 of them were fathers, two of whom sat silent in the back of Janigan's math class. Radwanski said he orchestrated the parents' day visit in an attempt to get parents in

the school.

"We are trying to involve our parents in our school so they can see what it's really like."

He said he sent invitation letters to each and every parent and asked them to RSVP. With class sizes being what they are this year, Radwanski said he had to limit the number of parents to 50 for each grade level. Pa-

rents were given a letter that outlined the game plan for the day. They were encouraged to write their comments on the back and drop it off near the office before they left.

A quick glance at the morning responses indicated parents were impressed with the school and the students' politeness and attentiveness in classrooms. There were also sev-

eral comments which commended the school's staff for the degree of cooperative learning.

Radwanski was also pleased with the response and the impression parents left with.

"We need to do more of these kinds of things to get the parents and the community into the schools to see what's going on," he said.

Board expects to formally approve contracts tonight

tendent for administrative services, confirms the contracts were never signed but said it was just an oversight on his department's part. He said it was his mistake that he didn't get the building administrators' contracts signed by the school board president after the board ratified that union contract on June 22.

He also overlooked putting the central office administrators' contract on the board agenda after that group agreed to a salary freeze in June.

"The economic issues of the contracts have already been decided on," Bolitho said. "So all that was left was the signing of the actual employment contract. It was a routine item that just never got done."

"It wasn't a real priority, and as we got into the year and got sidestepped

with transportation and the pay-to-participate program, it was just an oversight," he said.

All of the contracts are two-year contracts with the exception of new hires, which are on a one-year probationary period. They all expire June 30, 1994.

Bolitho said the seven central office administrators' contracts are identical to the two-year contracts that expired on June 30, 1992. Salary and benefits remained unchanged this year for the superintendent and his two assistants, the business manager, the two directors and for the executive director of special education. Each agreed to take a salary freeze in June after the demise of their millage increase request.

"They are no different than what they were before," he said. "The big issue is that the economic package

had already been decided on and approved by the board. It really is just a routine matter that unfortunately was not acted upon in the proper time frame."

"The salaries have already been approved and announced publicly. There is nothing new in there. It just needs to be a formal board agenda item, and they need to be signed."

The only change in the new building administrators' contracts is the addition of a benefit option. That option, Bolitho said, allows the 10 building principals and their assistants to convert benefits they would have taken anyway and use them as a salary improvement. Included in that option — which is a \$2,350 perk for school principals — are reimbursements for tuition, and physical and conference allotments.

In effect what monies the princi-

pals don't expend during the year for those three qualifying riders is returned to them in cash. The same holds true for the two assistant principals at the high school and the one assistant middle school principal, who each have a \$2,100-a-year benefit option.

Contracts for supervisors of the district's food service program, its operations and the Early Childhood Center also remain unchanged and

unsigned. Those contracts mirror their expired contracts in salary and benefit options. Bolitho said two of the three supervisors took voluntary pay freezes this year while the third contract was renewed at the old pay rate.

"It's a formality of sorts," said Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski. "It really doesn't affect the building contracts, because they have already been approved and ratified by the

board. But the one that is late is the central office and the supervisor's contract. Those need to be acknowledged by the board."

"It was really just an oversight with all that was going on here in June — laying off staff, restructuring the district, forming the pay-to-participate program and the transportation issue," Rezmierski said.

"To some degree it's understandable but not excusable."

It's a signal of change in Northville. Increased traffic along Beck Road has prompted Wayne County to add a full-service light at the Beck/Seven Mile intersection.

County workers busted themselves Thursday, rigging a light, stretching cables, and preparing to pull four-way stop signs from the ground.

A four-way flashing red light currently monitors the Beck/Seven intersection, but the corner will enter the world of alternating green, yellow, and red early this week, said Victoria Holland, assistant engineer of traffic operations for the Wayne County Roads Department.

The full-service light will operate between 6 a.m. and 11 p.m., and then switch to a four-way flashing red light between 11 p.m. and 6 a.m., Holland said.

The light is being added at the request of Northville Township. To qualify for a full-service light, the main street of an intersection must entertain at least 150 vehicles per hour over an eight hour period, as Beck/Seven accomplished earlier this year, Holland said.

Adding the light should break up severe traffic gridlock that some-

times grips the intersection. Morning and evening rush hour traffic sometimes backs vehicles a quarter mile south on Beck during those peak times.

"Hopefully, the signaling will alleviate backups," Holland said.

Holland said the new signal will have an 80-second cycle length. About 44 seconds of green light will usher through drivers on Beck, and about 28 seconds of green will grace Seven Mile, she said.

Beck is the more heavily traveled

road, and has witnessed increased traffic counts since it was paved north of Seven Mile in 1991. The county added the four-way red lights at that time, and said the intersection did not flush through enough traffic to warrant a full-service light.

City planners eye new zoning rules

The city would have a new zoning classification and another zoning district under two ordinances being considered by the Planning Commission.

Planning Consultant Don Wortman recommended Tuesday that the commission adopt a site condominium ordinance to recognize a new form of land ownership, and he suggested setting up an office research zoning district to allow land uses like computer research centers and light assembly operations.

The site condominium ordinance in particular is much-needed, he said.

"Right now the city doesn't have a site condo provision," Wortman said. "We want to make sure that the city has something in place if such a development is planned. . . . Much of our old ordinance work and subdivision work was based on laws that

didn't anticipate site condominiums."

The site condominium concept is simply another means of land conveyance available to a developer, Wortman said. Buyers of such properties, typically though not necessarily detached homes, only own the land on which their unit sits, like a condominium. The concept also incorporates common areas available to all of the property owners within the complex.

But like a normal subdivision, each buyer has exclusive rights to use an area of land immediately around his or her unit.

The problem from the city's perspective is that without an ordinance governing site condominiums, a developer could build such a complex and never have to bring it before the Planning Commission for review.

"You'd never get the opportunity to review things like road configuration as you would in a typical subdivision," Wortman said.

Under Wortman's proposal, site condominiums would be treated much like subdivisions under the city's ordinances, with building density and setbacks remaining the same.

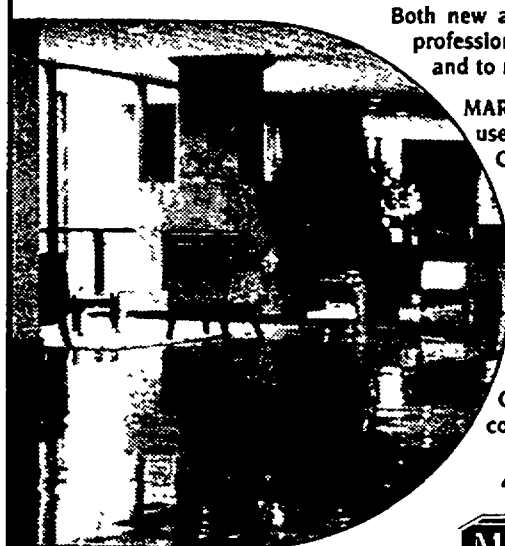
"The same city engineering standards that apply to a subdivision would be applied to site condos," he said.

Wortman's office research zoning district proposal would establish a new district to allow "office and research facilities . . . related to office, medical, testing, research, applied technology, computer technology and prototype planning."

The proposal follows discussion during the commission's drafting of last year's Master Plan, and could be applied to an area east of and including Northville Laboratories on Rural Hill Drive. The flavor manufacturer has proposed encouraging such development along a relocated Rural Hill.

"I view this as very much akin to office use," Wortman said.

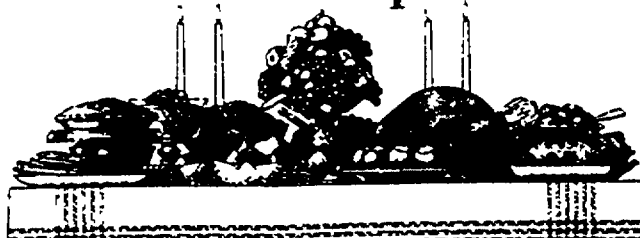

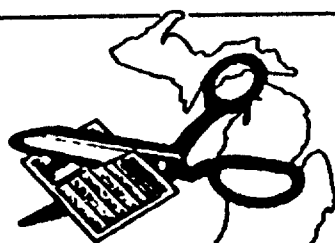

Fire Safety

Revolutionizing firefighting

The Industrial Revolution, with its emphasis on the invention and production of machinery, had a significant influence on the fire service.

The steam engine, providing greater pumping capacity and requiring fewer personnel than hand-operated pumps, was the first such development. With the invention of motorized apparatus, the same motor that brought the fire truck to the scene could also be used to power the piston-driven pump.

As with many areas of life in the early 20th Century, there was a ten-

dency to see the development of newer and better fire-fighting machines as the solution to the problem of fire. The focus shifted to fire suppression, rather than fire prevention. Our earliest ancestors had no choice; lacking the kind of equipment needed to fight large-scale fires effectively, they concentrated on prevention. In more modern times, there was a tendency to believe that almost any fire could be beaten back by human will, and superior machines.

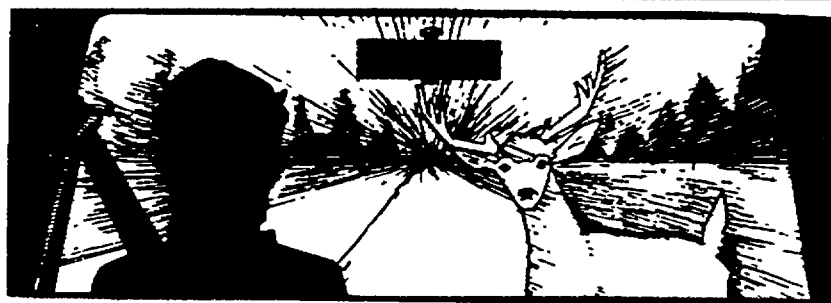
It remained true, however, that "an ounce of prevention" was worth "a pound of cure," and major strides have been made in the area of fire prevention during the last 100 years. The most significant development

has been the virtual elimination of the threat of conflagration. Modern building materials and techniques have served to limit the spread of any fire which does take hold. Modern building codes, for their part, have forced buildings farther apart, reducing the potential that a fire in one building will easily spread to another.

The results of this work can be seen in incidents such as those which occurred earlier this year in Los Angeles. Even with fires raging out of control in much of the city, they seldom spread beyond the buildings first involved.

The most recent trend in fire prevention is to limit the extent to which

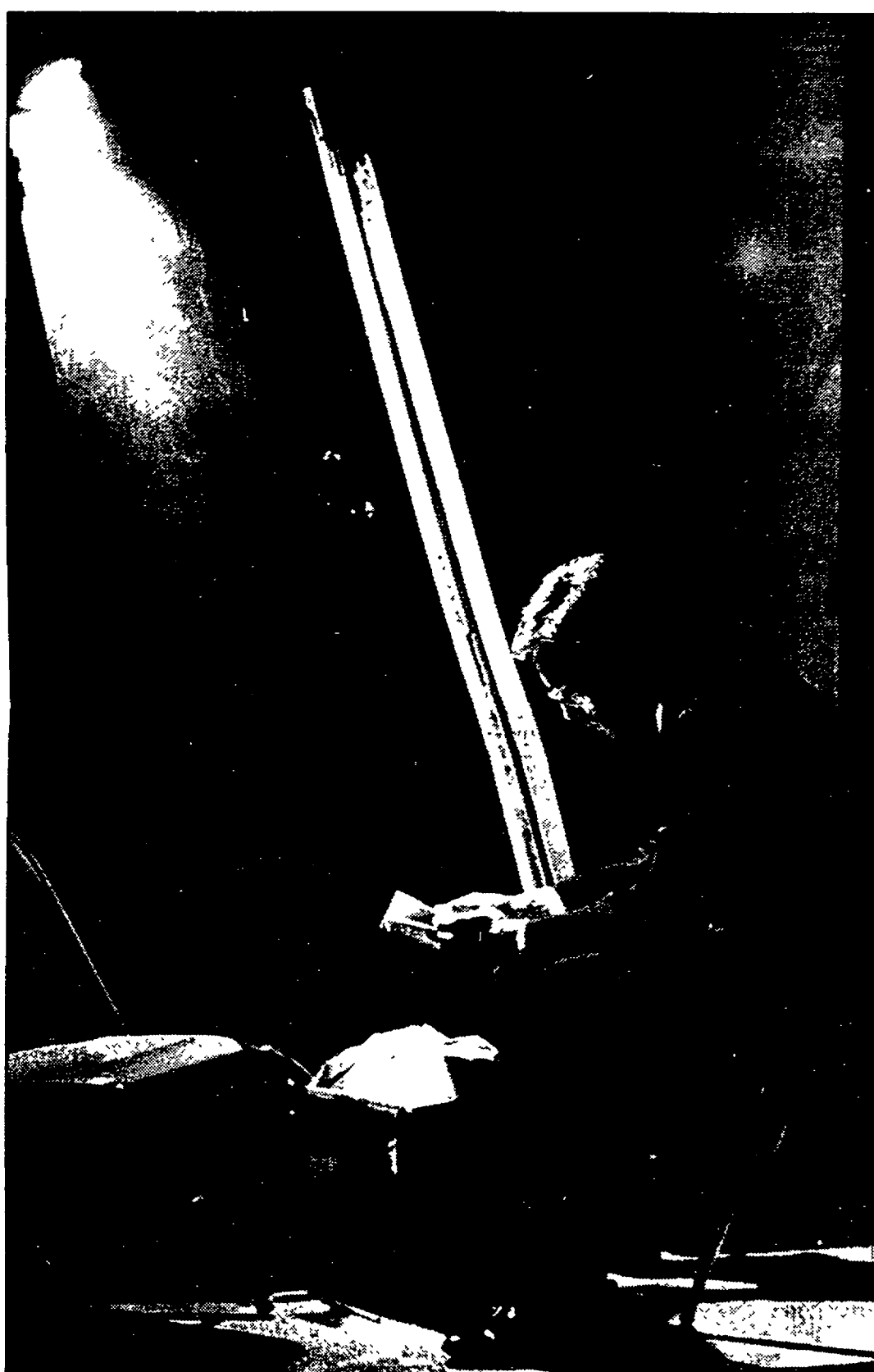

Make the most of reprieve from Ford

We can't guess at the motivation behind Ford Motor Co.'s sudden extension of a deadline for a firm offer from Northville to buy the old valve plant on Main Street.

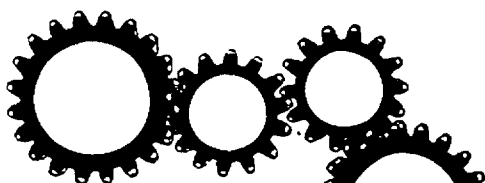
Whatever the reason behind the sudden elimination of the November deadline — with no firm replacement for it, either — the change gives new life to local efforts to create some sort of public use for the site. But the ball now sits in Northville's court, and if we may be forgiven for mixing our sports metaphors, the community's got to pick it up and run with it.

Zervos Construction's proposal for combined public/private use of the site provides a starting point, but only that. The developer has lately seemed to be the party most interested in pursuing this idea. With this new reprieve it's time for the public half to move, and quickly.

We believe the key to this entire issue is a public vote. With Ford sounding anxious and talking about deadlines a couple of months ago — and with an entire Township Board leaving office — that seemed impossible. Now it seems required.

Throughout this entire process Ford has been basically patient and concerned with local interests. We have to think that if the community did schedule a vote on a purchase proposal in the near future, the company would willingly wait out the results without selling off the site to a private, outside concern.

That really removes all the obstacles to an election. We strongly urge the plant site study committee to develop the bas-

ics of a plan, probably in conjunction with Zervos, which can be presented to both the City Council and Township Board. We would also encourage full involvement of the district library study group, since we continue to believe the Ford site would provide the ideal place for an expanded library. Ideally, both local governments could agree to a funding plan which would limit public expense, contribute to an improved tax base, and preserve public use of the Ford site, even enhancing it with a needed improvement like the library.

Once such a plan gets to a ballot, then it would be up to the voters. Residents of both the city and township have their say on a specific plan, and presumably the best possible one to meet all the competing needs at the Ford site. If such a plan passes, it would settle a lot of outstanding issues in this community; if it failed, the community would at least have its answer.

We're talking about a rather massive undertaking here; we realize that. But this juncture is critical; the community won't see another chance like this. It's vital to take advantage of it.

Top citizens show positive contributions

It's a very nice thing the Northville Community Chamber of Commerce does when it names a Citizen of the Year each fall.

Without the nomination and recognition process, it would be a lot easier to take for granted the people who give a lot of time and effort to improve Northville. And without the award itself, some particularly outstanding work might go unhonored.

This year, as usual, everyone nominated for the award has a history of important contributions to this community. But in a highly unusual move, this year the chamber could not narrow down to a single winner and named two, unrelated Citizens of the Year.

Greg Presley has his fingers in many different pies around Northville, and works to better the town through each one. Professionally, he enriches the community with high-quality architectural work, and he's a partner in Edward's

Caterer. His civic involvement largely follows a general theme of improving downtown, the heart of the community, and includes work on the city Planning Commission, the Downtown Development Authority and the chamber's Business Development and Retention Committee, and chairing the Ford Plant Study Committee.

Marlene Kunz directs Civic Concern, the vital, too-often-overlooked social services agency serving Northville and environs. She guides volunteers and oversees all the programs of the organization, which include providing emergency food, clothing and shelter assistance, and helping people avoid utility shutoffs. Without her tireless efforts, the community would be a colder place.

The chamber of commerce has picked two more very deserving honorees to honor this year. We join in thanking them for their efforts.

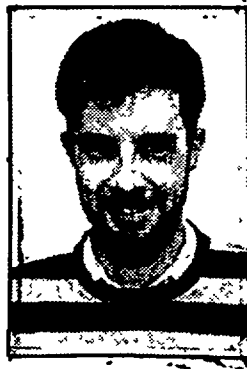

"I showed 'em that it wouldn't work," he said.

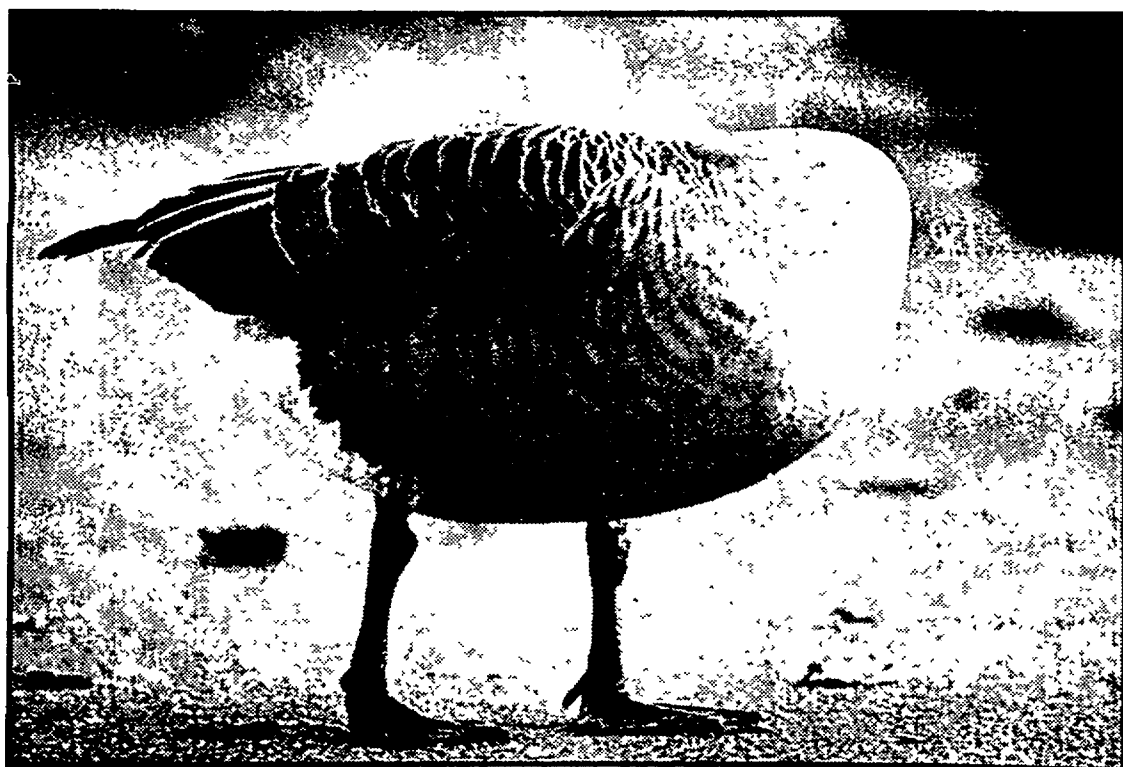
So Jerry went to work. He looked at what they wanted, applied a little trigonometry and would have 130 parts in about a week or so.

One experience with privatization



"Technology" and "privatization" are the latest political buzzwords.

Gov. John Engler's administration is studying how to use private contractors, for computer services in particular, in most departments. Detroit Mayor Coleman Young, once a union organizer, is so desperate to hold down union costs that he's talking about privatizing city services.

They should have been with me Wednesday, Aug. 5. The day after the primary election was one of (groan) Those Days.

8 a.m. — I'm at Oakland County's tallying station with a list of candidates for eight Observer & Eccentric and four HomeTown Newspapers. No more need to copy down numbers from tally sheets. The computer can spit out any district I want. Wonderful.

But the computer paper jams in the printer. Time savings: zero.

Armed with the results, I head to our closest office, Birmingham, to distribute them. "Fax 'em," said O & E managing editor Steve Barnaby, who is operating the numbers distribution service in Livonia. I do. Twenty minutes later Barnaby is on the phone — the transmission failed. I must fax 'em a second time.

For four editors in the Birmingham office, I

go to the copying machine. It breaks down — jams on every page, and here I am with the results of about 30 national, state and county races. Fortunately, a second copying machine is available in another department.

Are you keeping track? So far, three failures for "technology." I'm an hour behind schedule. 12 noon — Arrive in Lansing, where the Secretary of State's elections bureau fully expected to have complete results from 83 counties printed out by now.

"Not ready. Come back at 2 o'clock," they say. Wayne and Kalamazoo counties haven't reported.

2 p.m. — Wayne County is in, and the state issues an 82-county report. OK — our papers don't need Kalamazoo's results.

4 p.m. — Kalamazoo straggles in.

That was very curious. Kalamazoo is a compact county with 16 townships and three cities. When I worked there, three of us from The Gazette joined an assembly line about 8:45 p.m. Tuesday. Local clerks brought in tally books, and the county clerk's people passed them down the line. We'd be done by 1 a.m. and have time for a beer.

Why did it take 15 hours longer in 1992? "Technology" and "privatization."

Doubleday Bros. & Co. printed the ballots and provided the computer program, The Gazette reported. Vote-counting was halted at 1:30 Wednesday morning because of errors in a software program: Democratic precinct delegates had been left off the ballots, stickers were

substituted after a quick visit to a printer, and an untested computer software program failed.

It was a catastrophe. You expect government to screw up your mail, but election results should be sacred.

On Aug. 18, the four-member County Board of Canvassers scheduled a meeting with Doubleday officials. Doubleday honchos refused to talk before reporters. In a ploy to circumvent the Open Meetings Act, two canvassers met with Doubleday's people behind closed doors. One canvasser was absent, and one stayed outside.

Later the chair of the canvassers reported Doubleday "accepted responsibility" for the snafu. But as The Gazette noted in an editorial: "Let us re-emphasize that Doubleday has refused to give its side of the story."

Together we learn:

- Technology rarely is faster than hand methods, but it's always more expensive, and one crash can gum up an entire state.

- Private contractors hide from the public when things go wrong. For a government answering to voters and taxpayers, secrecy is illegal and immoral.

Keep that in mind when Gov. Engler and Mayor Young talk about privatizing important governmental services.

Conservancy eyes woods

purchase this woodland site or work with the owner to acquire a conservation easement for its preservation for all to enjoy for many years to come," Allen wrote in a letter to Tom Wolode, executive director of The Michigan Conservancy.

The Nature Conservancy receives daily requests for assistance from those with a favored plot of land, said Bill McCort, director of protection. McCort said several review steps are taken to determine if an area is of interest to his organization.

"The area needs to have some special ecological feature," McCort said. "It sounds like a gorgeous area, but from the information... it's just not enough to know (if The Nature Conservancy would have an interest)."

Information is gathered from a number of sources to determine if The Nature Conservancy is interested in the area, McCort said. If enough unique features unfold, staffers are sent into the field to survey the site.

If the property fits the organization's guidelines, The Nature Conservancy could purchase the land or work with the owner to manage the land, McCort said.

The initial review period is a month-long process, McCort said. During that time, the organization will decide whether or not it will proceed to protectionary steps.

City resident Jane Francouer has spent countless hours walking through the hardwood forest. A top

attractant to her is an area she says is "absolutely carpeted with wildflowers" in the spring.

"I would like to make people aware of the need for saving that woods," Francouer said. "You can't bulldoze it and buy a new one."

Francouer said she is working with township and city residents to protect the woods, and suggests appeals to Wayne County and the township would be a step in the right direction. Francouer hopes the county will set aside the 25-acre plot or that the township could offer tax incentives to the property's eventual developer.

The township's options appear limited, but it could embrace stronger protectionary measures for heavily wooded areas, said Carol Maise, township planning and zoning administrator.

Maise called the 25-acre site on the county land "a really nice clump of trees" but said many developers find it easier to clear out an area and pay for replacement trees. She said the township is hoping to be more proactive when it comes to tree protection.

"We're encouraging, and more or less requiring up front, that developers stay away from (leveling wooded areas)," she said.

Maise said the eventual county land developers could be asked to use the plot as an open space area, and that other creative means could be used to preserve the site.

a fire can get started in the first place. Of significance to this area is the greater use being made of sprinkler systems. A sprinkler or other automated fire-suppression system can attack a fire at its earliest stages, before it gets out of hand, leaving the fire department with little more to do than clean up and take a report. Originally specified for public and commercial buildings, sprinkler systems are now available for residential construction as well.

Fire suppression remains a principal occupation of most local fire departments, and just as at the turn of the century, fire departments are organized on different models depending on the needs of the local community. The type of fire department organization chosen by a community

will depend on a number of different factors, including the number of calls, financial resources and availability of volunteer or part-time personnel.

Different parts of the country also utilize different types of organizations. For example, in the western states it is not uncommon to find "fire protection districts." These distinct governmental bodies, like school districts, have their own boards and taxing authority and may cover several different political subdivisions.

It is also more common to find countywide fire departments in western states. In the eastern part of the country, outside of the large cities, the tradition of the independent volunteer fire company has remained in place. Today, however, it is common to find these companies organized under a common dispatch and com-

mand structure, and they will have formal agreements with the cities, towns or counties they serve.

In Michigan, most fire departments are organized by and operate as a function of the local municipality. In rural Michigan you will find some truly "volunteer" fire departments, where members receive no compensation for their services although equipment may be purchased with tax money from the local budget.

In suburban communities fire departments are often staffed with "paid-on-call" personnel, who are paid on an hourly basis when responding to calls. As finances allow and call volume demands, on-call personnel may be supplemented with full-time personnel working daytime or 24-hour shifts.

Larger suburban communities,

like big cities, are often staffed with full-time career personnel. All of these can be found in the western Wayne County area.

In the United States today there are over 1.2 million fire fighters, more than a million of whom serve as volunteers or are paid-on-call. They are a part of a proud tradition, dating back to our country's earliest days. As the threat of fire has diminished in many communities, they have accepted new tasks, including response to medical emergencies, hazardous materials incidents and natural disasters. A willingness to serve, and to change with the times, will bring about new traditions in the 21st century.

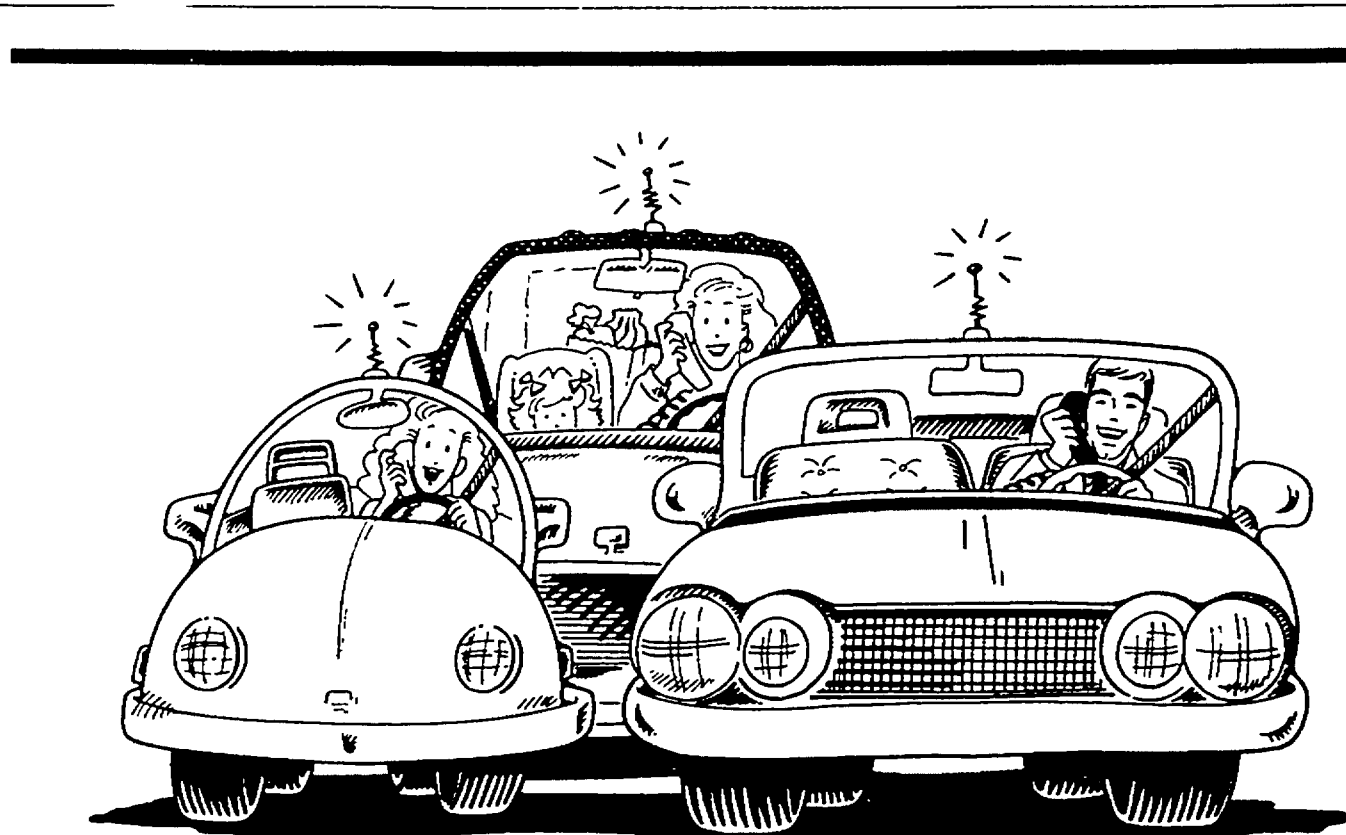

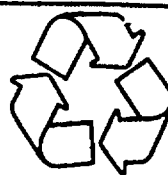

OCC's evening leaves her with stars in her eyes

My footsteps clicked on the pavement as I walked through campus. The quiet hum of the expressway and the sprinkling rain accompanied me as I headed toward Building J.

The instructors had long since gone home and the hurried buzz of the students would not return until Monday. It was Thursday, Nov. 5 and I, armed with notebook and pen, walked quickly with anticipation. The occasion was Oakland Community College's Hospitality Department's Culinary Olympics Celebration.

Three times a semester, the management students in the Hospitality Management Program host a gala dinner with different themes. These "student managers" plan, organize and execute these theme dinners, this one being the Culinary Olympics Celebration.

Culinary Olympics refers to the competition in Frankfurt, Germany, where chefs from around the world compete for the most outstanding recipes. The recipes used at the dinner are gold-medal winners from the Olympics, and were superbly recreated in O.C.C.'s kitchen by staff and students under the watchful eye of Chef Advisor, Jim Stawara.

Once I arrived at Building J, I caught the elevator and entered what I thought would be a familiar setting. The doors opened at the third floor and to my surprise I was greeted by a classmate in the livery and was ushered into the dining hall. Serenaded by a harp, I strolled about in delight, for my classroom had been transformed into a land of incomparable elegance. The illuminated ice sculpture echoed the shape of the harp and the light it cast enhanced the glow of the candles which reflected off mirrored centerpieces and golden stars. Together, they served as guides to my table where I deposited my belongings.

I ventured into the next room where the hum of words and laughter reflected the enjoyable time all were having. With only a few minutes until dinner, everyone finished their beverages from the bar and slowly made their way to the tables.

My table was already filling up with guests who were none other than graduate students and their husbands. Our salutations were interrupted by the serving of the appetizer, Wild Mushroom Terrine complemented by a Roasted Red Pepper Coulis.

The slightly tangy coulis set off the flavorful terrine as this perfect balance of tastes had been carefully matched so as not to outshine one another. As a good appetizer should, this dish whetted our appetites and we could hardly wait to experience the rest of the meal.

To our delight, the Mussel Soup came quickly, the steam still rising off the top. Accented by leeks and saffron, the soup was reminiscent of the sea without being overpowering. Its creamy texture was pleasantly emphasized by chunks of vegetables, creating a satisfying but not over-filling second course. Following close behind was the "intermission," or palate cleanser, Key Lime Sorbet.

Never before has this sorbet been so wonderfully made, even in the southern islands of Florida from which the name of this dish derives. Refreshingly light and cool, the taste was so pure that I envisioned myself on the beach, picking the fruit off the tree and eating straight from the skin. Biting into the raspberry and mint leaf that were served with it snapped me out of my daydream and I consulted the menu to see what was next.

The Main Course was Loin of Lamb Wyoming with Port Wine Sauce, Baby Vegetables and Potatoes au Gratin. Loving lamb, I barely allowed the waiter to set the plate down before I cut in. A butter knife would have bruised this tender meat which was by far the best lamb I have ever had. Wrapped with more lamb, pine nuts and parsley, the meat was cooked to perfection.

Some sage advice

What good is Thanksgiving without any side dishes?

The centerpiece of almost every Thanksgiving table is the turkey, roasted golden-brown — a reminder of America's Colonial past and that first day of Thanksgiving.

Although turkey is available year-round, this is still the time of year — the holiday season — when most turkeys are sold.

Turkeys come to market weighing anywhere from four to 24 pounds. Contrary to popular belief, larger birds do not provide more servings per pound than smaller birds. (The ratio of bone to meat is about the same in both large and small birds.) For plentiful portions, plan on 1 to 1½ pounds per person.

A survey of meat department managers showed the most popular size turkey is the 12- to 16-pound bird because of the trend toward smaller family units.

Here are some rules for buying, storing and using turkey and other poultry:

- Select a bird that has good coloring. Avoid those with grayish flesh or dried areas.
- Look for U.S. government seals of inspection.
- Fresh, tray-wrapped poultry may be stored in the refrigerator for about two days in its supermarket packaging.
- Home-frozen poultry may be kept for six months in the freezer.

Once it has been thawed, do not refreeze poultry without first cooking it completely.

- Cooked poultry may be stored in the refrigerator for up to two days, and may be frozen for up to two months.
- Poultry has been accused of causing food-borne illnesses. To be safe, wash all boards, counters and equipment that come in contact with anything that has touched raw poultry.
- Poultry that is on sale may be bought in quantity and repackaged in recipe-sized portions. For example, whole frozen turkey may be cut in half or quartered by the supermarket butcher for freezer storage in a size that will make a family dinner.

If your guests all like white meat turkey, look for a short-legged turkey, which means a plumper breast than birds with long legs, according to experts.

The most common cooking mistake? Overcooking the turkey gobbler. But a turkey without traditional side dishes doesn't deserve to be called Thanksgiving fare. This list emphasizes stuffings for the big bird.

CHEESY SPINACH STUFFING

- ½ pound bacon, minced
- ½ pound mushrooms, chopped
- 1 cup chopped onion
- 1 pound spinach, washed and trimmed
- ½ cup unsalted butter or margarine
- 1 package (16 ounces) herbed, seasoned stuffing mix
- 1 pound ricotta cheese
- ½ cup pine nuts
- ½ cup chopped parsley
- 1 teaspoon basil, crushed
- 1 teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon pepper
- 3 cups water
- Salt and pepper to taste

Yields 6 servings

In large skillet, cook bacon until softened. Add mushrooms and onion and cook, stirring often, until mushrooms are browned and onions are tender.

Add spinach and unsalted butter. Cook 1 minute to soften spinach. Remove from heat and combine with herb-seasoned stuffing mix, cheese, nuts, parsley, basil, salt, pepper, and water. Blend well. Stuff into turkey and truss.

FRUIT SAUSAGE STUFFING

- 1 cup chopped dried apricots
- ½ cup golden raisins
- 1 cup apple cider
- 4 tablespoons butter
- 1 cup finely chopped onion

- 1 rib celery, finely chopped
- ¾ teaspoon thyme
- ¾ teaspoon marjoram
- 9 to 10 slices firm white bread, cubed and lightly toasted
- 1 pound bulk turkey sausage
- ½ cup chopped pecans
- ½ cup minced parsley
- 1 teaspoon freshly ground pepper

Yields enough stuffing for 1 18-pound turkey
Marinate apricots and raisins in apple cider 4 hours or overnight at room temperature. Melt butter in large skillet and saute onion and celery until limp, about 5 minutes. Add thyme and marjoram and mix well. Transfer vegetables to large bowl or baking pan. Add bread cubes and toss.

Return skillet to heat and saute sausage meat, cooking until golden-brown. Drain fat and add sausage to crouton mixture. Add rest of ingredients, including dried fruit and marinade. Toss again.

OYSTER STUFFING WITH WATER CHESTNUTS

- 1 pint oysters
- 1 cup finely chopped onion
- ½ cup chopped celery
- ½ cup parsley
- ½ cup margarine or butter
- Water
- 1 (8-ounce) package corn bread stuffing mix
- 1 egg, beaten
- 1 (8-ounce) can sliced water chestnuts, drained
- 1 teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon thyme
- ¼ teaspoon sage
- ¼ teaspoon pepper

Yields enough stuffing for a 10 to 12 pound turkey.
Drain oysters, reserving liquor. In small frypan, saute onion, celery and parsley in margarine until tender but not brown. Add enough water to the reserved oyster liquor to make 1 cup.

In bowl, combine stuffing mix, egg and oyster liquor. Toss lightly to blend. Stir in sauteed vegetable mix, oysters, water chestnuts and seasonings. Spoon stuffing

loosely into the cavity of ready-to-cook turkey. Bake turkey as directed.

Stuffing may also be baked in a lightly greased 2-quart shallow baking dish. Bake at 350 F for 15 to 20 minutes, or until heated through.

CORN PUDDING STUFFING

- 3 medium onions, chopped
- ½ cup chopped fresh parsley
- 5 medium celery ribs, chopped
- 1 medium green pepper, chopped
- 1 stick butter
- 4 cups coarse corn bread crumbs
- 3 cups cream-style corn
- 4 eggs, beaten
- ¼ teaspoon thyme
- ¼ teaspoon freshly ground pepper

Yields 10 to 12 servings.

In heavy skillet, saute onions, parsley, celery and green pepper in butter until onions are transparent. Meanwhile, spread corn bread crumbs on baking sheet and toast very lightly at 325 F about 10 minutes (not necessary with packaged corn bread stuffing crumbs.)

In mixing bowl, lightly mix all ingredients just before ready to bake. Season with salt and pepper, as desired. Package crumbs are drier than homemade corn bread, crumbled and toasted, so additional water might be necessary, but stuffing shouldn't be soupy. This may be stuffed into the turkey, but it's easier to pile it into greased 2-quart baking dish and bake at 325 to 350 F for about 40 minutes, or until surface is nicely browned.

This classic is from "The Fannie Farmer Baking Book" (Random House)

PUMPKIN MUFFINS

- ½ cup (1 stick) butter, softened
- ½ cup brown sugar
- ½ cup molasses
- 1 cup mashed cooked pumpkin
- 1 egg, lightly beaten
- 1½ cups all-purpose flour (we use half whole-wheat, if desired)

Clean isn't always safe in restaurant kitchen



"Chef, there is a Calvin Manning at the door."

Calvin is the Health Inspector assigned to our area of Novi. We first met while getting ready to open the restaurant. He walked through with

me pointing out potential problems and promised to return soon. We have a great relationship. Each is honest with the other. I value his input and he respects our emphasis on proper procedures.

I can remember a time, in an earlier life, that the words Health Inspector sent chills. That was before I realized that a

clean kitchen doesn't necessarily mean a safe kitchen with regards to food. Calvin is quick to point out that spotless is great, but correct storage of food in the accurate temperature ranges is much, much more important.

Usually health inspections take place on a semi-annual basis. There is no forewarning that the examiner will be visiting. This, I suppose, is meant to keep restaurants on their toes. Personally, each and every day, all day, we could be inspected and pass with a very respectable score.

The "Food Service Establishment Report" is a list of 44 components that cover every aspect of dealing with food. Any items that are checked off are in violation of the law. A perfect score is 100. The more serious the offense the higher the points associated with it.

For instance, clean or soiled linen not stored properly means the deduction of

one point, while improper food protection, meaning that potentially hazardous food does not meet temperature requirements during storage, preparation, display, service or transportation, brings a whopping 5 points off the bottom line.

All refrigerators and freezers must have hanging thermometers. At a glance we can tell if there are fluctuations. These thermometers have a nasty habit of self destructing. We check constantly to be sure they are replaced as needed. The higher the temp in a "box" (slang for refrigerator) the quicker food spoils and bacteria grows.

There are strict regulations as to where specific foods may be stored. Raw products must be below cooked food. As an example, if raw chicken liquid drips on a cooked roast that is to be sliced for sandwiches, there is a very good chance for salmonella poisoning to occur. The roast is already cooked so heat will not be a factor

in the killing of any bacteria.

Moreover, imagine that the roast, with drippings from raw chicken is brought out by the prep cook to cut on the slicer. He gets distracted and lets it sit on the counter for an hour. During this time the bacteria has been exposed to room temperature, its favorite, for the promotion of rapid growth.

The plot can thicken even more. He slices the roast on the slicer and places the meat in the walk-in then brings out a ham and slices it. Then a turkey. Another drastic error has been made. The slicer was not cleaned and sanitized after each use. All of the meat has been contaminated.

It is going onto a tray that will again sit at room temperature on the buffet table. Those little bacteria are thrilled. More heat to encourage brisk development

And then . . . we eat the meat and become violently ill. "Going from both ends."

Most of the time we will just assume that we "have the flu." It is always going around you know. This cross contamination scenario is not hard to have happen if management and staff are not educated and devoted to the precise handling of food.

Last week Calvin was in for his routine inspection. This is the third time. I always walk through the kitchen with him as he follows the list. Each meeting is a learning experience. Every time our kitchen gets better. He and I are a team working toward the same goal — wholesome food and a sanitary kitchen.

1/4 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon baking soda
1 1/2 teaspoons cinnamon
1 teaspoon nutmeg

Yields 1 dozen
Preheat oven to 400 F. Grease muffin pans or line them with paper baking cups.

Combine butter, brown sugar and molasses in mixing bowl. Beat until creamy. Add pumpkin and egg, and mix well. (At this point, mixture will look curdled, which is OK.)

In another mixing bowl, combine flour, salt, baking soda, cinnamon, and nutmeg. Stir and toss them together with a fork or wire whisk. Add combined dry ingredients to creamed mixture. Beat just until batter is smooth, about 20 seconds, with mixing spoon. (The mixture will be stiff.)

Spoon into muffin pans, filling each cup about 3/4 full, and smooth batter with slightly dampened fingers. Bake for about 15 minutes, or until a wooden pick inserted in the center of a muffin comes out clean. Remove from oven and serve warm.

What's a holiday table without yams? These candied yams are a family tradition dating back decades. Make plenty because people will take seconds. Don't boil yams in water: it dilutes some of the root vegetable's flavor. Personally, we always have fresh yams, but if you're intent on using canned, see the next recipe.

ESTHER'S CANDIED YAMS

8 or 9 medium-size yams
1/2 cup brown sugar, packed, or to taste
1/2 pound (1 stick) butter or margarine, cut into small pieces

Yields 1 9x13-inch pan
Scrub yams to clean but do not peel. Preheat oven to 350 F. Place in pan in 1 shallow layer and bake for 45 to 50 minutes or until soft. Remove from oven and set aside to cool. When cool enough to handle, peel each yam and slice in half lengthwise. (Or bake yams the day before and refrigerate over night. Yams will peel even easier the next

ORANGE SPICED YAM PUDDING

30 gingersnap cookies
3 cans (23 ounces each) yams, drained
3 large eggs
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg
1/2 teaspoon ground allspice
1/2 cup sugar
Grated peel of 1 orange
1 cup half-and-half
1 cup orange juice
2 tablespoons lemon juice
2 tablespoons butter or margarine, at room temperature

Yields 12 to 14 servings.
Preheat oven to 350 F. Butter 9x13-inch glass baking dish.

Crush gingersnaps in food processor fitted with metal blade or with rolling pin until they are fine crumbs. Reserve 1/4 cup for topping. Press remaining crumbs over bottom of baking dish.

Mix yams in large bowl with electric mixer at medium speed until fluffy, about 2 minutes. Add eggs, one at a time, mixing well after each. Mix in salt, cinnamon, nutmeg, allspice, sugar and orange peel.

Reduce mixer to low speed and slowly pour in half-and-half and orange and lemon juices, mixing until incorporated. Pour mixture over crumbs, smoothing top. Sprinkle with reserved 1/4 cup crumbs. Bake with uncovered.

Bake casserole, uncovered, in center of oven for 1 hour, or until it is puffed and golden. A knife inserted in center should come out clean. Let pudding rest 20 minutes. Cut it into squares to serve. The casserole may be refrigerated or frozen after

it is baked. Cool it to room temperature, cover, and refrigerate or freeze. Before serving, bring it to room temperature and bake at 350 F for 30 minutes, or until heated through.

CRANBERRY SAUCE

2 cups sugar
1 1/2 cups water
1 pound cranberries

Yields 10 1/2 cup servings
Bring sugar and water to boil; add berries and boil for about 5 minutes, or until skin pops. Cover and let stand until cool. Chill before serving. For thicker sauce, boil sugar and water 5 minutes before adding berries.

CIDER CAKE

1/2 cup butter
1/2 cup sugar
2 eggs
3 cups flour
1 teaspoon baking powder
1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
1 cup cider

Yields 6 to 8 servings.

Cream butter and sugar. Add eggs and blend well. Sift flour, baking powder and spices.

Add flour mixture and cider alternately to butter mixture, beginning with flour and stirring well after each addition. Batter will be stiff.

Pour into two greased 5x9-inch loaf pans or two 8x9-inch pie plates. Bake for 50 to 55 minutes in a 350 F oven.

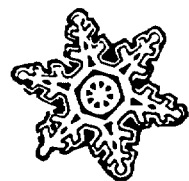

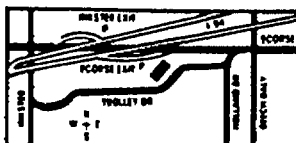

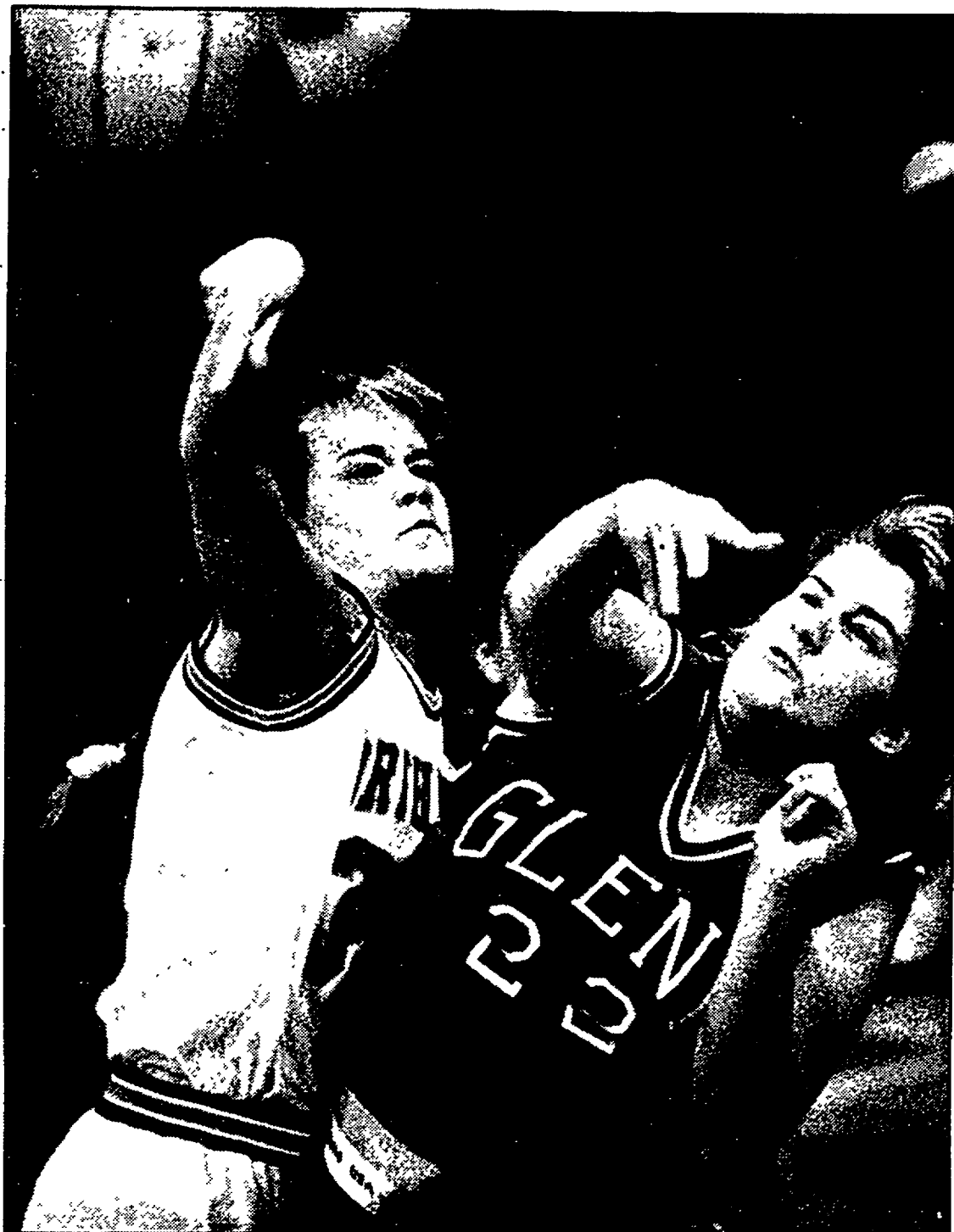

Northville falls to Salem 46-22 in state playoffs

A long season for the Mustang basketball team came to an end Wednesday night as Plymouth Salem dumped Northville 46-22 in the second round of district playoffs.

The Rocks upset state-ranked and cross-campus rival Plymouth Canton in the opening round of the state playoffs to face Northville, which had drawn a first-round bye. According to coach Bob Shoemaker the district game was a microcosm of the Mustangs' entire season: good defense, poor shooting and lots of turnovers.

"If we were a good offensive team we had a chance to win the game," he said. "Our defense was good enough to win; our offense wasn't."

Northville shot less than 20 percent from the field (8-for-51). The Mustangs also had 24 miscues with the ball.

"We had the shots," Shoemaker said. "But we couldn't put the ball in

the basket."

Northville finished the '92 campaign with a 5-15 record.

Despite 4-for-22 first half shooting, the Mustangs trailed just 20-10 at halftime against Salem.

The Rocks led 12-5 after one period. Shoemaker said it was hard for his team to get into its offense against Salem because of its pressure defense. The Rocks applied three-quarter-court pressure and pressure on Northville's ball handlers to force turnovers, he said.

Northville played good defense as well in the first half.

"When they shot we had a hand in their face," Shoemaker said. "Our kids worked hard."

Beth MacLean led the Mustangs in the first half with six points. Karl Krupansky had three.

Salem put the game away early in the third. The Rocks increased their lead to 20 points before the midway point of the quarter.

Northville trailed 34-16 by the end

of the period. With the game out of reach, Shoemaker said he played his entire squad in the fourth. MacLean led the Mustangs with seven points in the game and Krista Howe added five.

"We finished the season the way we started it," Shoemaker said. "They played hard, they played together and they played good defense."

Although the team's record might not indicate it, Northville did improve this fall, he said.

"Everybody that's seen us say we have improved a lot," Shoemaker added.

The coach commented that his players did their best under difficult circumstances.

Shoemaker took over as coach shortly before the start of the season. Longtime Northville skipper Ed Kritch resigned last summer for personal reasons.

"Our goal was to stay together as a team," Shoemaker said. "I think we have."

Northville resident Mike Mittman recently won all-state honors in cross country for his performance in the state finals held earlier this month in Flint.

Mittman, running for Detroit Catholic Central High School, posted the fastest time in Class A at 15:55.8. The senior, who attended Meads Mill Middle School in Northville, qualified for the state finals by winning his regional race held last month.

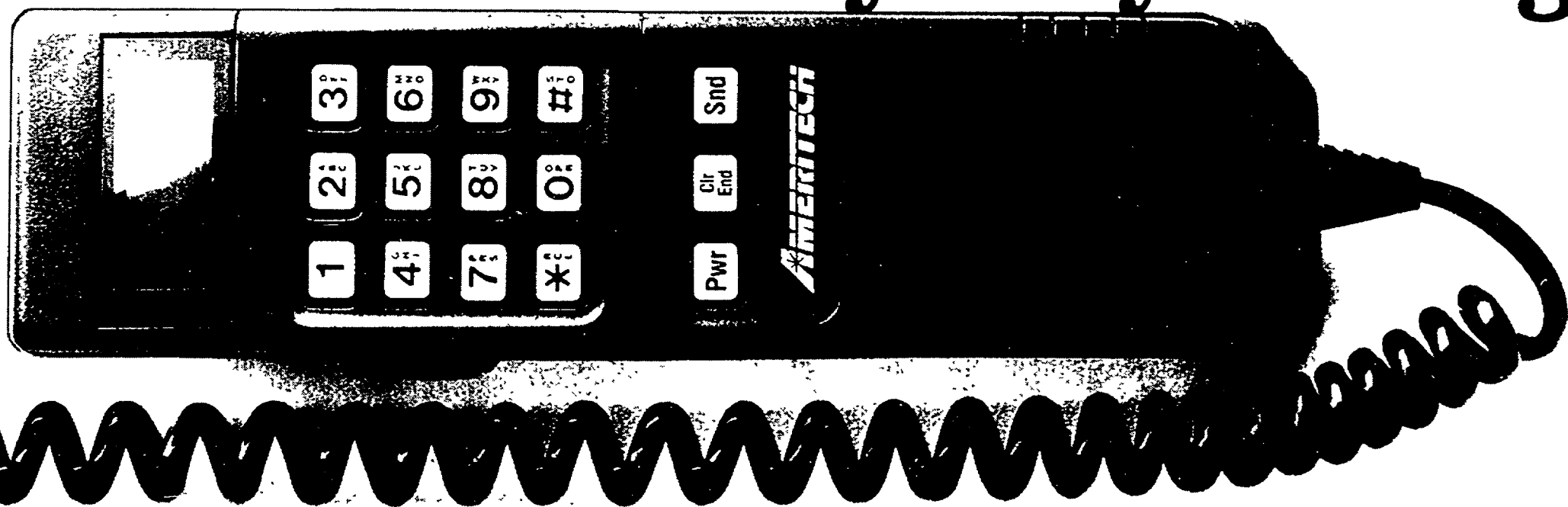
Northville had two other top finishers at the finals.

Tucker plays can-do principal in 'A Town Torn Apart'

'Doc' Littky offers paradigm for success

Michael Tucker is excited about his latest TV movie, *A Town Torn Apart*, but he's afraid it won't get the attention it deserves.

Airing Monday, Nov. 30, on NBC, just a day after the books close on the networks' "sweeps" ratings slugfest, *Town* offers neither gunfire nor glamour, the usual commodities peddled by the network publicity machine. Instead, the movie dramatizes the true story of how a high-school principal turned his school around and the unorthodox methods he used to achieve his results.

The premise was such a long shot, Tucker says, that his friend and co-producer David Rintels initially warned him, "I don't think we can get a network sale on this." But NBC's entertainment chief, Warren Littlefield, was apparently swept along on the tide of the *L.A. Law* co-star's enthusiasm, and he made *A Town Torn Apart* the anchor of the network's "The More You Know" education and public-service week.

In the drama, Tucker plays

Dennis Littky, a doctor of psychology and Long Island school principal who left his career in education and moved to a small New Hampshire town, where he became the editor of the local newspaper. He lived in a primitive log house outside town with a pretty cellist who wasn't his wife, and the townsfolk viewed him with suspicion.

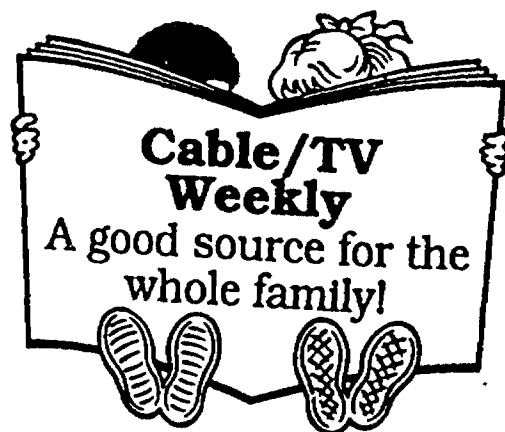
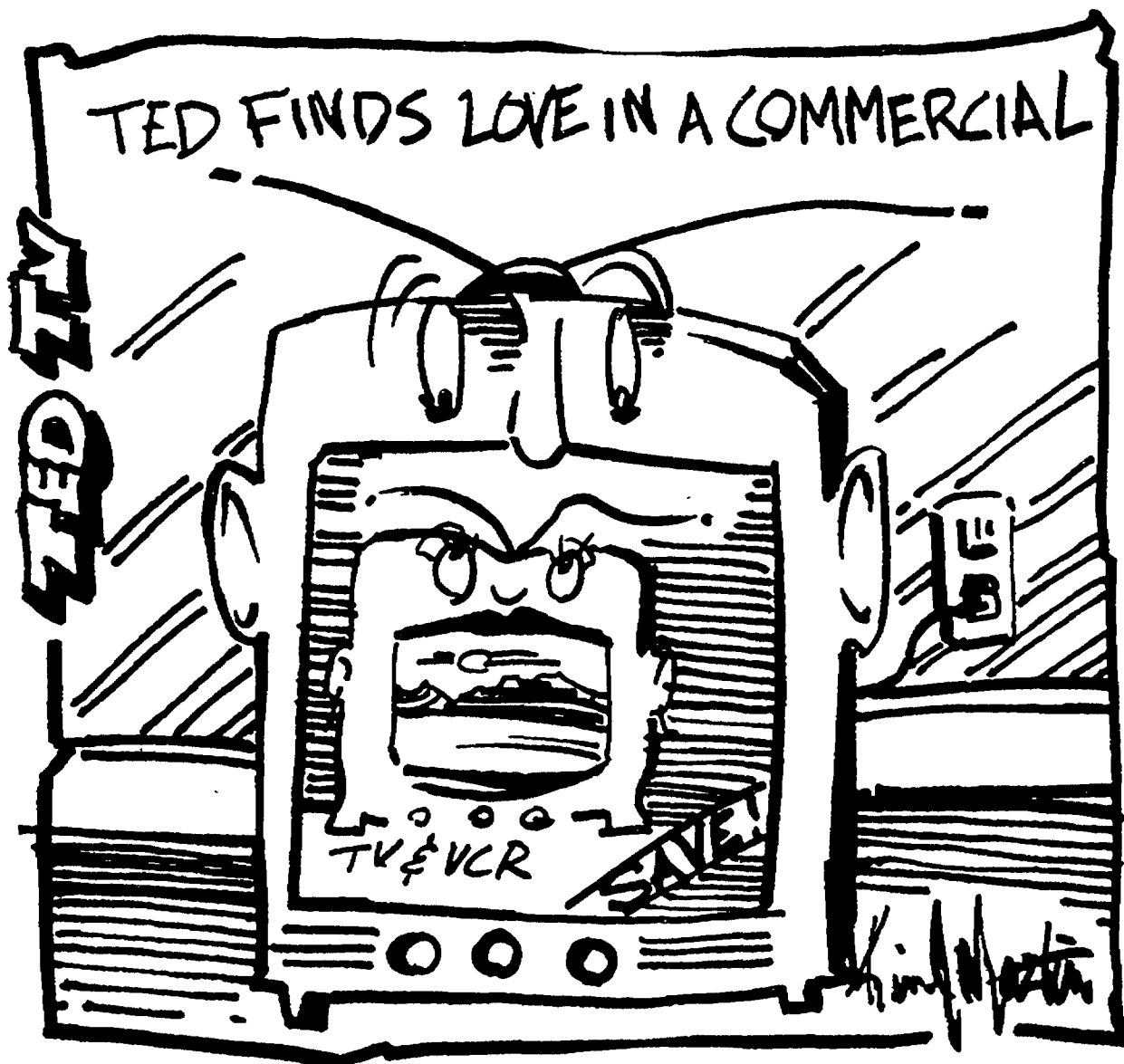
As the movie opens, Littky becomes aware of serious problems at Winchester's Thayer High, which is smeared with graffiti, crippled by violence and sinking fast. At Thayer High, kids don't expect to graduate, much less go on to college. To everyone's surprise, Littky produces his credentials and applies for the job of principal.

Littky works all summer to transform the appearance of the school using paint and supplies donated by parents after the first of many Littky pep talks. His strategy is to encourage the students to take pride in their school and to reach out to each individual in an effort to ignite a passion for learning. He

eliminates study hall, sends students into town to take part-time jobs that will teach them math and science and sets up small groups mentored by faculty members to make sure the students have a network of emotional and academic support. He even persuades one teacher (Jill Eikenberry) to take on the challenge of tutoring a special class of slow readers in an off-campus location.

Littky's proposals are unsettling, but he quickly wins over both students and teachers. Parents are another matter. Despite the success of Littky's methods (test scores are rising, and students frequently stay at school during the evening to work on class projects), a group of traditional-minded citizens takes umbrage and tries to block Littky's return for a second year at Thayer.

The movie chugs along as indefatigably as Tucker's "Doc" and provides several emotional highs, but best of which is the unveiling (filmed at the real Thayer High) of a mural painted by a drop-out student during Littky's first summer. These moments make up for a certain sappiness in the script, and the overall effect should inspire any leader, educator or not, to keep trying, no matter what the odds.

The show's guest hosts don't have to give flawless performances; they're more than welcome — almost invited — to stop, stammer and smile their way

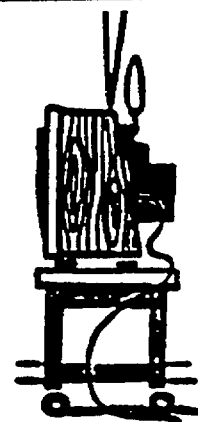

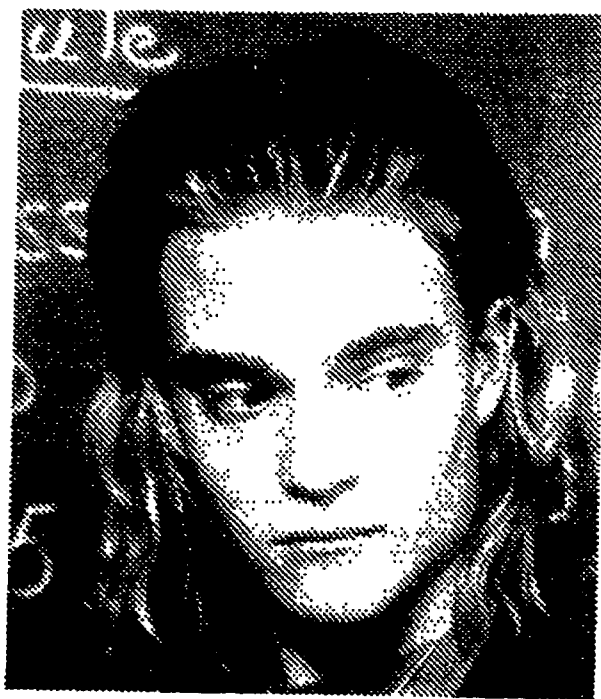

Q: I was watching an old movie, *The Drums*, the other night and noticed it starred Sabu. Could you please give me some information on him? When and where was he born? What are some of his other movies, and were any made in his adulthood? Is he still alive? —Don W. Schneider, Chillicothe, Mo.

A: The exotic-looking child actor was born Sabu Dastagir in Karapur, Mysore, India, on Jan. 27, 1924. He was working as a stable boy for a wealthy maharajah when American documentarian Robert Flaherty cast him in the title role in 1937's *Elephant Boy*. The mysterious and carefree persona of that and the following similar characters he played captivated both British and American audiences and led to a number of other films spotlighting the Indian boy in various adventures. His most notable role, of course, was as Mowgli in a 1942 screen adaptation of Rudyard Kipling's *The Jungle Book*, a precursor to the animated Disney film in 1967. His career waned when the mystique of jungle films did the same, and after moving to Hollywood, he starred in a handful of other films before his sudden death as a result of heart failure in 1963.
