## Group not interested in forest

A county-owned plot of historic hardwood trees might be well worth preserving, but someone other than The Nature Conservancy must be the savior.

The Nature Conservancy will not attempt to buy a 25-acre plot on Wayne County land west of Sheldon Road in Northville Township, a Conservancy official said in a Nov. 24 letter to *The Northville Record*.

"As we understand it, the property is currently in public hands," wrote William McCort, director of protection for the Michigan Chapter of The Nature Conservancy. "We hope the property remains in public ownership and currently are not pursuing acquisition of this property."

A former township official had asked the Conservancy to step in to save the hardwood forest, which boasts a variety of trees including su-

gar maple, walnut, beech, and black cherry.

Former Trustee and Planning Commissioner Richard Allen feared development of the county land site could spell the end for the plot he called "an excellent example of native Michigan hardwoods in all their splendor."

The Nature Conservancy, a national, non-profit organization which seeks to protect delicate and threatened species, was eyed as a possible purchaser of the land. But McCort said his organization is flooded with similar requests.

He suggested the county transfer the land to the state Department of Natural Resources. If the county was willing to transfer the forested plot, but demanded some compensation, the property could be turned over to the Natural Resources Trust Fund, a DNR grants program for purchasing property in the state, McCort said.

## New board seeks new law firm

Don't expect a complete purge of political holdovers at Northville Township hall, but the new administration is set to broom some key players from past regimes.

First on the chopping block is Sills, Hemming, Law, Essad, Polaczyk and Gillary, the law firm with the pyramidal ties to the Western Townships Utilities Authority sewer project.

The township is seeking bids for legal services, and could tab a successor by the new year.

"The new board feels it's something that needs to be looked at," said Township Supervisor Karen Baja. "We want to see what's out there and what might better serve our township."

Township Manager Richard Henningsen said he will contact more than a dozen law firms that expressed interest when the township checked into new legal hands earlier this year.

Baja wants movement on the attorney front, Henningsen said.

"She would like to have it done in three weeks," he said, adding that the current firm will have the opportunity to tender a bid.

Formerly Law, Hemming, Essad & Polaczyk, the firm entered the township fold in the mid-1980s and played key roles in a wide array of township and WTUA projects.

The firm was never subjected to competitive bidding for jobs ranging from public relations and lobbying to WTUA bond counsel, and raked in well over \$1,000,000 in WTUA fees alone.

Law, Hemming also served as attorneys for Plymouth and Canton townships, and its partners were frequent contributors and supporters of local politicians throughout the three-townships area.

Baja said the township is looking for a firm with a strong background in labor negotiations, a record of success in court cases, and experience with government operations similar to Northville Township's. Nearby offices are a plus, Baja said.

The township may be open to discussion on an in-house attorney, an idea broached in January but never fully pursued. The new board may talk about that option at a Dec. 3 public study session.

Baja said the law firm is the only professional-services outfit that will be looked at for now, but in-house slots could be up for review at the

Dec. 3 meeting.

The new board will meet in closed session following the public meeting to talk about current staff, Baja said.

"There will be a closed session to discuss personnel and where we want to go," Baja said. Asked if Henningsen's position would be reviewed, Baja said it "would be premature to speak on specifics" before the entire board met.

Henningsen was hired as township manager in 1989, serving under former supervisors Georgina Goss and Betty Lennox. Prior to his appointment as manager, he was a longtime township treasurer.

His tenure has been rocky, marked by spats with residents over the gravel roads treatment issue, and some staff pointed to Henningsen as a primary reason the clerical staff voted to unionize.

## Schools change AIDS education

Northville school officials will implement a separate and focused HIV/AIDS curriculum, complying with a state mandate that requires them to do so.

The School Board last Monday night adopted the curriculum, which was written locally by a team of elementary school teachers, parents and staff last spring.

It targets students in grades four through eight and will be in place from 1992-97.

Dolly McMaster, assistant superintendent for instructional services, presented the curriculum which uses a wealth of materials to teach students

about human sexuality, human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) and acquired immune deficiency syndrome (AIDS), and about related drug-abuse prevention. Portions of the lesson plans are borrowed from the Michigan Model for Comprehensive School Health Education, while the balance was tailored for fourth- through eighth-grade classes.

McMaster said a draft of the curriculum was written under her direction by a special committee of teachers and presented to the district's Healthy Advisory Board earlier this year. That board made some minor revisions to the committee's draft and then endorsed it June 10. The K-12 Curriculum Council and the school board's Curriculum Subcommittee reviewed and approved the new curriculum on Nov. 18.

Prior to writing the curriculum, the committee reviewed all the latest related videos, films and filmstrips on the market that dealt with human sexuality and growing up. They also reviewed the applicable lessons plans from the Michigan Model and the teaching materials and videos the Michigan Model recommends.

Committee members and the Health Advisory Board agreed to replace some of the previously used filmstrips and videos with updated, more comprehensive and useful teaching tools, McMaster said.

The composition of our Health Advisory Board, responsible for developing this curriculum, represents exceptional knowledge, expertise and experience.

## Local nurse helps overturn policy

She may be an angel of mercy, but Ann Carlan is no lightweight in the legislative arena.

Carlan, a registered nurse with a new Northville permanent makeup clinic, helped overturn a state policy requiring anyone applying permanent makeup to obtain a cosmetology license first.

Permanent makeup is similar to tattooing except that the dyes can be applied more precisely than with a tattooing gun. The relatively new procedure, also known as dermamechology, is used to apply coloring to

eyebrows, eyeliner and lips and can be used to cover unsightly burns and scars.

Carlan was shocked to find out from a *Northville Record* reporter earlier this month that officials at the state's Bureau of Occupational and Professional Regulation (BOPR) said she had to obtain a cosmetology license despite her medical training.

So was State Rep. Michael Benne, D-Detroit, who chairs the House Public Health Committee. Carlan and five other nurses, including Patti Woodbridge of the Michigan Association of Clinical Dermatechnologists, took their concerns over

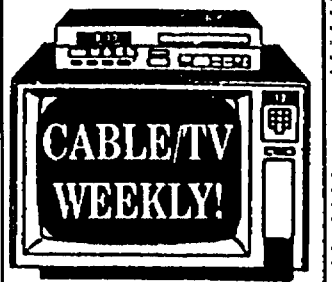

# Schools revise disease policy

School Board members adopted a revised version the district's policy on communicable diseases to reflect changes and increased threats those diseases pose.

The board last Monday accepted the recommendation of its Policy Subcommittee to revise the district's 1986 policy for communicable diseases.

There were several slight revisions to the old policy, which includes the procedure school officials will use in handling an infected student or staff member.

The revised policy says when reliable evidence from a doctor, parent or guardian confirms that an infected person has a communicable disease that is known not to be spread by casual contact, he or she has the right to remain in school. But if the superintendent learns the person is

contagious and poses a health risk to others, he or she may be removed from the classroom.

Language in the policy was updated to protect students and employees from communicable diseases that are spread by bloodborne pathogens.

As home to Wayne County's center program which meets the needs of special education students, district officials have an immediate concern for the safety and well-being of staff

and other students who work with center program students infected with Hepatitis B.

The revised policy mentions Hepatitis B and the HIV/AIDS virus but is not limited to those diseases. The policy also says that mandatory screening for communicable diseases that are not known to be transmitted by casual contact is not warranted as a condition for school entry, employment or continued employment.

ience in this field," McMaster wrote in her recommendation of the curriculum to the board. "The deliberations were open, candid and served the educational interests of students, parents and staff."

"This document reflects their commitment to teaching for responsible learning by our students in this area of great local, state and national concern."

McMaster said the curriculum is written and intended to supplement students' sex education at home. She also said it's intended to encourage parents to talk to their children about sex and all the associated choices and consequences that

surround it. In an effort to keep parents involved, the committee also recommended that the district create a special program for parents that will involve Health Advisory Board members and teachers.

Responsible decision-making, self-esteem, peer resistance and a solid education of concepts of human sexuality, family life and the transmission, treatment and prevention of sexually transmitted diseases are all intended goals written in the curriculum.

In general, the curriculum mandates that certified teachers will teach the human sexuality lesson plan to boys and girls in grades four, five and six in separate sessions.

The existing seventh- and eighth-grade curriculums have been revised and four new lessons have been added to teach abstinence to middle school aged students.

For each grade level there are teaching kits available to assist teachers with their lessons. Barb Flis, chairperson of the Health and Safety Committee of the Northville Coordinating Council of PTAs, was a member of the committee that devised the curriculum.

"I served on this committee," she said. "It took a number of hours to view the tapes and discuss things... I'm quite confident in what we've done, and what we've come up with."

## Portable extinguishers: important fire defense

When the office had first instituted a no-smoking policy in the summer, Mary had little difficulty sneaking outside for a cigarette. Now that colder weather had arrived, she was forced to be more inventive. So it was that on a cold, damp afternoon Mary was just finishing a cigarette in a storage area in the back of the office when she heard someone enter and call for her. She stubbed out the cigarette on a metal storage shelf, pitched the butt into a nearby waste basket, and headed back to work.

A few minutes later, while Mary chatted with her visitor, they both noticed a smell of something burning. Mary immediately suspected what was wrong, and she rushed to the storage room to find the waste basket in flames, with fire spreading to the paper products stored on nearby shelves. Mary quickly yelled to her visitor to alert the other occupants of the building and call the fire department. She then grabbed a fire extinguisher from the wall opposite the storage area, pulled the pin, and turned back toward the fire.

Most fires start small. If discovered quickly enough, before they get out of hand, most fires can be effectively fought with a portable fire extinguisher. Commercial buildings are required to have fire extinguishers available for use in order to stop fires while they are still small. Fire extinguishers are also increasingly available for home use. If the correct extinguisher is available, in working order and used in an efficient manner, a potentially tragic situation can be reduced to a minor inconvenience.

Fire extinguishers have been available since the late 1800s, but have undergone many changes since then. The earliest fire extinguishers used poisonous chemicals to put out fire, and have since been banned. Today, fire extinguishers typically use dry chemical, carbon dioxide, halogenated hydrocarbons (halon), foam, or water.

Not every extinguisher is appropriate for every fire. For this reason, a classification system has been created to assist in making the necessary decisions. Class A fires involve ordinary combustible materials, such as wood, paper and cloth. A Class B fire involves flammable liquids, grease or gas. A fire involving live electrical equipment is called a Class C fire. Finally, though rare, fires in-

volving combustible metals such as magnesium, titanium and potassium are classified as Class D fires.

Selection of the appropriate extinguisher is very important. For example, a water extinguisher is very effective on a Class A fire. Applying water to a Class C fire, however, involving live electrical equipment, could cause a dangerous electrical shock. And application of water to a Class D fire involving magnesium will only cause the fire to burn more intensely.

Some extinguishers are labeled with these A-B-Cs, with each letter assigned its own distinctive shape and color. Newer extinguishers may use pictographs, visually demonstrating the types of fires on which the extinguisher can, and cannot, be used. When selecting an extinguisher for your home or business, make sure it is approved for use on the types of fires most likely to occur there.

The contents of most fire extinguishers are stored under pressure or in a gas cartridge activated by a lever, allowing the agent to be propelled from a nozzle and toward the fire when used. In general, extinguishers are operated by pointing the nozzle at the base of the fire, applying the agent in a sweeping motion. Be sure to read

the manufacturer's instructions regarding proper use.

When confronted with a fire, be sure to warn other occupants of the building and make sure the fire department is called before attacking the flames. Many fires have gotten out of hand simply because the fire department was not called until after several fire extinguishers were emptied in an unsuccessful effort to check the blaze. When in doubt, do not endanger your life to fight the fire. Remember that the contents of the extinguisher will be rapidly used up. If the fire is too large, get out right away.

Mary knew that the extinguisher on the wall was a dry chemical model approved for use on Class A, B and C fires. She pulled the lever, releasing the stored pressure, swept the nozzle from left to right and quickly smothered the flames in a cloud of dry chemical. As she caught her breath, Mary heard the sirens of the fire trucks coming down the street. She felt sheepish about causing the fire, and would have some explaining to do, but her knowledge and quick reaction saved her office from more serious damage.

### Downtown needs deck, and it must be paid for

It's a real shame that debate over the funding of a new downtown Northville parking deck has become cast as a battle between the Downtown Development Authority and the Northville School District. Really, both entities' ultimate goal is the same: a strong community.

It could easily be argued that Northville's two most vital resources — the two biggest reasons people live here — are the public schools and the downtown area. The deck financing plan has put the two into apparent conflict and angered a lot of people on both "sides."

We believe a new deck is indeed necessary downtown. And we believe that captured taxes must play a significant role in its financing, although the DDA can act to show good faith and ease the impact on the schools.

To begin at somewhere near the beginning, a lot of people who are rightly worried about the schools' financial shape question the need for a new downtown deck. We frankly don't see a lot of room for debate on that point, however.

Even with the parking gains made with reconfiguring the downtown lots, they will still all fill up on occasion, particularly during this prime shopping season. That's true with the old deck in use, and that deck is crumbling rapidly. Without a new deck the city will see a net loss in parking spaces very soon — a loss it can ill afford.

That becomes even truer when figuring that downtown will see additional commercial development in the next few years, including the CadyCentre plan at Center and Cady, and the Long plan for the corner of Main and Wing. Both those developments, along with any other projects which may come along, will increase the demand for parking downtown.

Without a new deck, the downtown will see a sharp reduction in available parking during a time of increasing need. That's a sure recipe for killing downtown, and no one wants to see that happen.

If downtown Northville is to remain strong, a new deck is a must. And the sooner, the better; the old deck constantly gets closer to failure, and the longer we wait, the more a new deck will cost.

That raises the far thornier question of how to finance the deck. The DDA has developed a plan to extend its use of "captured taxes," the funding system which paid for the Mainstreet '78 improvements, in large part making downtown Northville the attraction it has become.

The DDA may have settled on the idea of continued tax capturing too readily. Certainly that group did not anticipate the backlash against its proposal. The difficulty in funding this new deck makes us wonder if the city hasn't mis-handled its parking system in the past. Monday-morning quarterbacking, yes, but it seems like the involved system of buying parking credits and the complex parking deal with MainCentre should have been better able to anticipate and handle this funding problem.

With the problem upon us, though, the options appear few. Under tax capturing, the schools — and every other government which levies property taxes in the city, including the city itself — loses out on increasing revenue resulting from rising property value in the downtown district. They still collect property tax, but the higher taxes resulting from assessment increases get siphoned off to the DDA. Right now, that money is just finishing paying off the Mainstreet '78 improvements; the plan now is to continue that siphoning for a few more years to build the deck.

This idea is far from perfect. Yes, the school district and other taxing units need that money too. However, it's important to remember a few points.

For one, the SEV wouldn't be increasing so much in the first place if not for the DDA improvements. Now that they're made, they do need some upkeep and continued attention. Not funding the deck would begin a downward slide which could have disastrous consequences — like falling assessments downtown, which would actually reduce the revenue from downtown property.

Second, the schools should see some financial relief next year. We're not about to predict anything about state funding shenanigans in relation to public schools, but the assessment freeze of this year is set to expire. That will mean a two-year jump in revenue over this year for any government which holds its millage steady.

Third, the DDA funding plan is rather conservative. The initial plan forecast that the schools would begin to see the increasing revenue by the year 2000, but with the election results — turning down "Cut and Cap" — that could come years sooner. In addition, any new development downtown — which a new deck would encourage — will help pay off the bonds sooner and end tax capturing that much quicker.

Some opponents of the DDA funding plan have gone so far as to call it "taxation without representation," but that's more of a reach than we're willing to make. It's not that taxes paid on Northville Township or Novi land would go to DDA, which is how some people seem to be oversimplifying the issue. Rather, the DDA district isn't supporting schools to the same extent that other areas are, which is a different matter. Remember, downtown businesses don't put demands on the school district in the first place.

Now, as we said earlier, tax capturing does seem like a hardship to governments which survive on property tax. The Northville School District in particular has suffered blow after financial blow, and although this plan does not take away more money, it does delay an expected source of increasing revenue.

The DDA could take a step to limit the impact on the schools and to show good faith that it's willing to support its own interests. Earlier this year, DDA members kicked around the idea of a special tax — it can be up to 2 mills — on downtown properties alone. At the time, they had no clear idea of what they'd use the money for, and we expressed a great deal of unease with higher taxes downtown. We still don't, but here's a very necessary project for which such a tax might be considered.

We believe a downtown tax for the parking deck — maybe levied only after the city's current debt-reduction millage gets lifted — would serve twin purposes. It would pay off the parking bonds sooner still, further limiting any impact on the schools, and it would send a message that the downtown area is willing to sacrifice for its own long-term benefit.

No matter if this becomes part of the formal financing plan or not, a public vote on this question is absolutely essential. The City Council seems poised for such a vote, and properly so. This has become such a controversial issue that we believe it should only move forward if the voters approve.

Hanging over all this controversy — as if things weren't complicated enough already — is a recently circulated petition which demands something, but it's not clear exactly what. A simple public vote on moving ahead with a certain deck financing plan, we hope, would resolve the issue.

To end up back where we started, it's really too bad that this situation deteriorated the way it did. We hope everyone can come together and agree on a plan to get a new deck built; we believe it really will be in the best interests of the entire community.

### Eatery maintains tradition



I suppose you could say it's because of Chuck Muer that I'm in Michigan. It's a reach, but not much of one.

Way back in the late 1950s, Grandma, Grandpa, Uncle Frank and a few other relatives moved from Brooklyn to Detroit when their employer, the New York Central Railroad, merged with the Pennsylvania Railroad and moved its headquarters out here.

Mom and Dad stayed in New York, but we visited Detroit often. Mom says I took my first steps in the summer of 1964 at Grandma's house in Redford.

One thing Grandpa always said he missed about New York was the ever-available fresh seafood. Fortunately for him, he discovered the Muer chain of restaurants in the area, where fresh seafood was a specialty. A visit to Grandma and Grandpa's usually meant a trip to Joe Muer's downtown, Charlie's Crab, Clamdigger's, the Sundog. When the Gandy Dancer opened in Ann Arbor, that became a destination too.

We consumed plate upon plate of lobster, crab and broiled flounder, wolfed down mountains of ice cream with Chef Larry's caramel sauce, and always, but always, started the meal with a bucket of Manhattan-style (what else?) clam chowder.

We often made a day out of a trip to the Gandy Dancer, sightseeing around the U of M campus or browsing for books at Borders.

Somehow, I got hooked. Upon graduation from high school, I attended U of M, and moved here to stay.

So it brought back a kind of nostalgic fondness when I saw that Chuck Muer was to be partners with one of his chefs,

Chuck Rachwitz, in the new Rocky's of Northville.

I attended opening night at Northville's newest eatery last Monday, and was happy to see that old Muer quality was back in town.

Rachwitz calls the decor "sort of a hunting lodge, but nicer." There are plenty of warm woods and dark greens, but a bare wood floor in the bar declared the casual nature of the place. Look closely at the striped awning over the bar. The stripes are actually printed fishing rods.

Muer's wife, Betty, had a hand in the decorating, which includes a 40-foot mural of the Rocky Mountains, painted by local artist Diane Sybelldon.

But I was there for the food. Here and there the menu spotlighted some of the old favorites. Mussels Muer was among the appetizers. Muer Cellars wines were listed. Chef Larry's name appeared a couple of times (an homage to Muer's former executive chef Larry Pagliari). And as always, there was a selection of eight or nine jet-fresh fish entrees.

But Chef Rocky's hand was apparent in the menu, too. His famous Roadkill Chili was available as an appetizer. His signature dish, potato-encrusted whitefish, headlined the fish dishes.

The barbecued baby back ribs beckoned, and I was nearly lured by the rack of lamb with sweet potato chips. Instead I opted for the intriguing. The complexity of turkey breast au. polvre with a Dijon brandy sauce was too much to resist.

If opening night is any indication, I bet Rocky's of Northville could cause a visitor to stay.

I headed out into the bone-chilling and blustery winds of Sunday, Nov. 15, for my favorite daytime comfort food: a brunch of French Toast at the Dandy Gander on Main Street. The sun peeked out from behind leaden clouds, and though I knew it would remain but a few minutes, the tiniest glimmer of hope emerged from piles of winter clothing and feelings of gloom.

Then the most amazing thing happened. As I turned down Center Street onto Main Street, I glimpsed the first Christmas decorations being put up. The camaraderie and cooperation were evident by the smiles on their faces, as they tried to ignore the cold and complete this massive undertaking. I found out later that some stayed from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m.

An unexpected feeling of joy rushed through me. Only in Northville could this happen. I was so glad I live here.

And so it was with a new resolve and vigor that I decided to return home after brunch and plunge into cleaning and de-cluttering, with an eye to bringing up Christmas treasures and ornaments.

A flash of enlightenment illuminated my actions: November is a month and time of preparation. For Christians it is Advent, a reflective time to think about the birth of the savior. For all of us, a fallow time in which to prepare for the glitter of the holidays before the hectic pace takes over, and stresses us to the point of exhaustion.

While I will never thrill at the prospect of cleaning an oven or defrosting a refrigerator, I will attempt to see the larger picture. I will do that which needs to be done now so that I may enjoy the holiday season with as little hassle as possible, and visit friends and relatives.

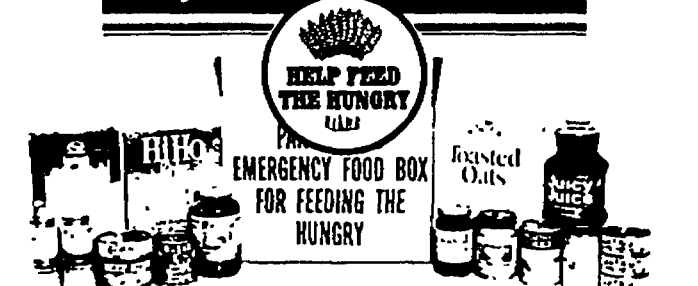

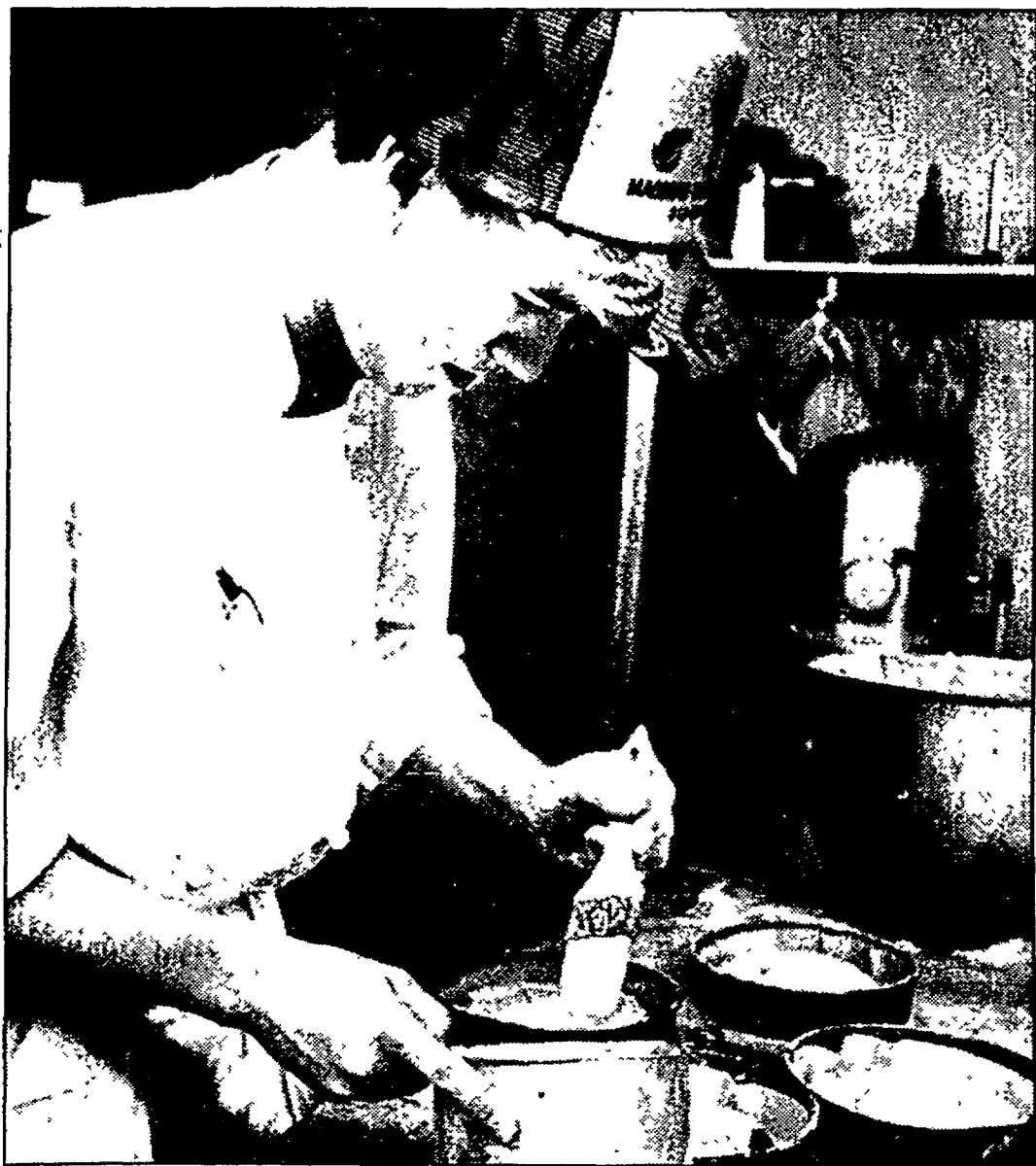

## Local nurse helps change state policy on licensing

the requirement to Bennane's Lansing office. He quickly concluded that the requirement was based on a faulty assumption.

That assumption apparently was made by Judy Dennis, licensing administrator for BOPR's Board of Cosmetology. Dennis cited a 1989 attorney general's memorandum that said dermatology "falls within the definition of cosmetology . . ." In advising inquirers that a cosmetology license is required to practice the technique.

Dennis wrote to one inquirer July 21 that "in Michigan, only licensed cosmetologists may perform this service in a licensed cosmetology establishment."

"It was an improper correspondence," Bennane aide Cindy Peruchetti said last week. "The way the letter was written, it implied that only cosmetologists were licensed to do it . . . What they were giving out was absolutely inaccurate, and they don't do that anymore."

Bennane wrote Wooldridge on Nov. 17 and noted he had informed the BOPR that "the letter sent out by Ms. Dennis and the information the board has been supplying over the phone has been in error. The letter should have read that cosmetologists are authorized to perform such activities under their scope of practice, but so are all other allied health pro-

fessions whose scope allows for invasive procedures. Nursing and medicine are certainly two of the licensed health care professions that would be authorized to perform these activities.

"Registered nurses who are performing permanent dyeing of the skin are within their scope of practice and can continue to perform these activities without fear of state intervention."

Carlan's plight was detailed in a Nov. 9 Northville Record article, as was the story of a Farmington Hills woman fined \$350 for letting her cosmetology license lapse while still applying permanent makeup. Bennane's office used those articles to show the BOPR that registered nurses were being unfairly targeted by the licensing board.

Carlan recently signed a lease for a MainCentre building office to house her permanent makeup salon, Facialis. The move followed her completion of an intensive two-day course in Detroit and a week of hands-on training in Atlanta offered by the Alabama-based firm Dermoflage Clinics.

"You can't believe the kind of money I have invested in this, loans that I've taken out to go into this," she said shortly after opening up shop.

Carlan said she invested in the emerging field not just for the potential financial rewards, but also for the technology's application to procedures like hair transplants, scars

and burns.

"I thought, 'Well, at least I can do something and see positive results and feel good about my nursing' . . . I thought it would be rewarding," she said.

Carlan, who had been concerned that the Nov. 9 Record article would drive customers away, said last week that it may have had the opposite effect.

"Strangely enough, they read the article and I don't know if they took pity on me or what, but they've been coming in and so far they've seemed pleased with the results," she said.

Carlan herself may be pleased to know that her case may trigger tighter controls over dermatology, controls that may force cosmetologists to obtain more health-care experience before practicing the procedure.

Rep. Bennane has said his committee will conduct more research into "invasive procedures" like permanent makeup and tattooing, since the skin-piercing procedures carry the risk of transmitting infections or triggering allergic reactions.

As Bennane noted in his letter to Wooldridge, "a requirement in the course work for permanent dyeing is the taking of a health history. There is obviously no course work requirement in the cosmetology curriculum concerning health histories or other medical procedures . . . I will begin to look at some minimum requirements for professions such as these that utilize invasive procedures

### Brandy carries taste of summer all winter long

Although the fruit industry has developed cold-storage preserving techniques, there's nothing like the taste of tree-ripened fruit. It's a taste associated with summer and recalled throughout winter.

Thanks to a centuries-old technique, these flavors are available in liquid form year-round in spirits bottlings known collectively as eau de vie.

Translated as "water of life," eau de vie is a generic French term for brandy or spirits.

Exact origins of alcohol distillation are unknown, but a 13th century French alchemist Arnaud de Villeneuve is given the credit for first describing it in detail.

Today, many regions of the world make brandy by distilling wine or by distilling grape pomace (remains after the grapes have been pressed), or distilling fruits after the completion of fermentation.

Eau de vie, as discussed in this column, will refer to fruit brandy, usually a clear, unaged spirit carrying the intense aromas of fermented fruit from which it is distilled.

The most well-known eau de vie is produced from the Williams pear, a relative of the U.S. Bartlett pear. France and Switzerland produce the greatest quantities of this eau de vie, simply labeled Poire Williams, but a small, quality production is beginning to make its appearance from California and Oregon. In addition to the Williams pear, eau de vie is traditionally produced from plums, cherries, raspberries, elderberries, apricots and quince.

Kirsch or Kirschwasser (cherry brandy) is produced from a wild black cherry indigenous to the Rhine Valley. Due to the meanderings of this great river, Kirsch is produced in three countries — Switzerland, the headwaters of the Rhine; France in the Alsace region, along the Rhine's western banks; and the Black Forest region of Germany to the east.

Important elements of production are strictly followed in the creation of the world's finest eau de vie. Fruit, picked at the peak of ripeness is carefully prepared for the month to 10-weeks-long fermentation, and only free-run juice is distilled. The Williams pear is slightly crushed to open the fruit. Stone fruits and berries are fermented whole.

After fermentation completes, the fruit wine is doubly distilled as soon as possible. To preserve the fruit aromas and flavors, it is most important that the distillate be chilled quickly.

To our taste, some of the most interesting eaux de vie come from the Swiss producer Etter and make a stunning after-dinner companion strikingly enhancing any meal.

Etter's eaux de vie are exclusively imported to the United States by Birmingham's Robert Denton & Co. Ltd. and sold through the Elite Spirits division. Denton also distributes the internationally recognized artisan bottlings from Clear Creek Distillery in Portland, Ore. In addition to standard eau de vie, Clear Creek produces an Apple brandy that is smoother, more complex and flavorful than most Calvados.

Etter's artistic packaging is unrivaled. Hand-blown bottles with suspended handblown fruit in the middle are produced by renowned Swiss glass artist Peter Schreiber. They are collector's items, and if you're looking for an unusual gift presentation, search no further. They are available in all fine wine and spirits shops in the area. Approximate cost is \$191.33.

The finest eaux de vie, even those in standard bottles, are expensive. The following details offer understanding. About 13 pounds of black mountain cherries are required for one 750-ml bottle of Etter Kirsch. About 50 pounds of specially tree-ripened pears go into each 750-ml bottle of Etter Poire Williams.

For maximum enjoyment as an after-dinner drink or dessert accompaniment, serve eau de vie in a freezer-chilled glass. Heighten flavors of a fresh fruit cup with the addition of a small amount of your favorite eau de vie.

Prepare Crepes au Kirsch or flavor homemade ice cream with Framboise or Kirsch as a simple, yet elegant dessert.

## The serious late-night snack

### Chocolate chip cookies are rich in history

To a confirmed chocoholic, there can be nothing to equal a soft, still-warm-from-the-oven chocolate chip cookie. Not ice cream, not cherry pie, not even the touted better-than-sex cake.

The chocolate chip cookie can be the perfect offering to a cranky child, the supreme appeasement for a lover's quarrel, the ideal gift to a special friend or the ultimate bedtime snack.

The latter struck the fancy of Chester Soling, owner of The Orchards, an inn in western Massachusetts. Gwen Steege writes in her book, *The Search for the Perfect Chocolate Chip Cookie* that Soling offered guests fresh-baked chocolate chip cookies and cold milk by their beds every night.

In early 1987, he decided to sponsor a nationwide contest to find the very best chocolate chip cookie. Some 2,600 recipes later, a winner was picked, and Steege's book resulted. The grand-prize winner was a moist, double-chocolate cookie from the Junior League of Las Vegas.

If there's a standard for chocolate chip cookies, it's the tollhouse recipe on the back of packages of Nestle Chocolate morsels.

The legendary tollhouse cookie got its name from a lovely old tollhouse on the outskirts of Whitman, Mass., according to Dick Curd of Nestle Foods. Built in 1709 at the halfway point between Boston and New Bedford, it became a haven where weary travelers stopped for food, drink and rest while they waited for a change of horses.

The tollhouse was purchased by Ken and Ruth Wakefield in 1930. Stagecoaches stopped at the Wakefield's restaurant to pay a toll at the gates.

Fame came to the inn with Ruth's invention of a brand-new kind of cookie. Having run out of nuts for a favorite Colonial butter cookie recipe called "Butter Drop-Dos," Ruth substituted broken bits of Nestle semi-sweet chocolate bar, expecting them to swirl into the dough as they baked and melted. Though they melted somewhat, they still were definitely little chunks of soft chocolate, and her new "Chocolate Crispies," as she called them, quickly became a favorite with customers.

After the recipe was published in a Boston newspaper, the cookie so caught on with New Englanders that increased sales of Nestle's semi-sweet chocolate bars in the Boston area caused Nestle officials to investigate.

To make it easier to use their chocolate in the new recipe, Nestle scored the bars so they would break readily and even invented and marketed a special chopper for cutting the chocolate up, writes Steege.

In 1939, Nestle began making chocolate in morsel form, bought the tollhouse name from Wakefield's a year later and began printing the original recipe on the back wrapper of the package.

It's still a good recipe, but passionate chocolate chip cookie lovers have altered it slightly.

Laurie Klein, who manages the chocolate creative kitchens for Nestle, says the company stands by its original tollhouse recipe, one thing that's not likely to ever change.

The recipe on the back of the wrapper has only been changed once — half a teaspoon of water has been deleted. "It was in Mrs. Wakefield's original recipe, but we found it made no difference whether the water was added or not."

For those who like oatmeal in their cookies, Klein recommends adding only 1 cup to the tollhouse recipe. Keep the amount of flour the same, she says.

Nestle recommends only using butter — not margarine — in cookies.

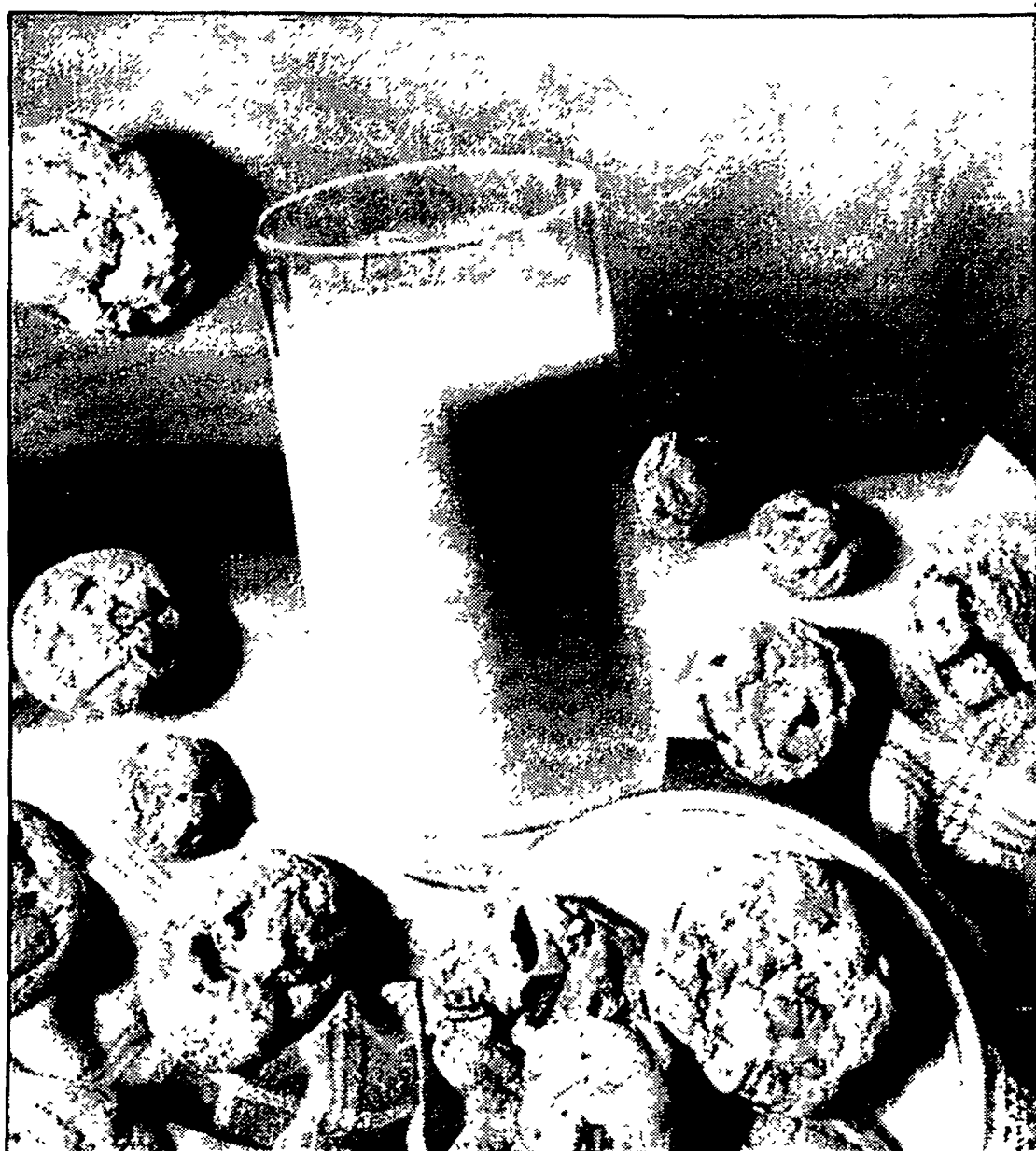
"Light or tub margarine has a lot of air whipped in that makes a difference," says Klein. "The same with Crisco. For that traditional tollhouse butter, melt-in-your-mouth flavor, it takes butter."

It isn't necessary to take the butter out of the refrigerator in the morning and wait until afternoon to get it soft enough to bake cookies. A better method is microwave the stick for 10 seconds — just so you can squeeze it in the middle and it will still hold its shape. Melted butter is a big no-no.

The butter and sugars should be creamed for two minutes. After five minutes the shortening tends to warm up too much, says Klein.

Large eggs should be used right out of the refrigerator.

And then there's the matter of the proper cookie sheet. Nestle recommends the old, heavy-gauge cookie

sheets.

"The darker the surface the hotter the cookie will bake, causing it to thin and flatten," says Klein.

She also offered some tips for common chocolate chip cookie ailments:

● Cookies are too dry: It may be because the flour is not measured properly. Spoon flour into a dry measuring cup and level with the straight edge or a knife or spatula. Check the cookies a few minutes before the end of the baking time to they do not overbake.

● Cookies bump into each other during baking: The cookies are too large or are not spaced far enough apart on the baking sheet. It is also possible that the dough is too thin, either from using too little flour or too much liquid.

● Cookies are too brown: If only the bottoms are brown, chances are the baking sheet was too close to the bottom of the oven. If they are entirely overbrowned, either the oven is too hot, the cookies are smaller than the recipe specifies or the baking sheet is touching the sides of the oven.

● Cookies stick to the baking sheet: Either the baking sheets were not sufficiently greased or certain ingredients adhered to the sheets. Remove the cookies from the baking sheet almost immediately.

#### ORIGINAL NESTLE TOLLHOUSE COOKIES

2 1/4 cup flour  
1 tsp. baking soda  
1 tsp. salt  
1 cup butter  
3/4 cup granulated sugar  
3/4 cup brown sugar, firmly packed  
1 tsp. vanilla extract  
2 eggs

12 ounces (2 cups) Nestle TollHouse semi-sweet chocolate morsels  
1 cup chopped nuts  
Yields 5 dozen.

In small bowl, combine flour, baking soda and salt; set aside. In large bowl, combine butter, sugar, brown sugar and vanilla extract; beat until creamy. Beat in eggs. Gradually add flour mixture. Stir in chocolate morsels and nuts.

Drop by level measuring tablespoons onto ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 375 F for 9 to 11 minutes.

#### DOUBLE CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIES (From the Junior League of Las Vegas)

1 3/4 cups flour  
1/4 tsp. baking soda  
1 cup butter or margarine, softened  
1 tsp. vanilla extract  
1 cup granulated sugar  
1/2 cup dark brown sugar, firmly packed  
1 egg  
1/3 cup unsweetened cocoa  
2 Tbs. milk  
1 cup chopped pecans or walnuts  
6 ounces (1 cup) semi-sweet chocolate chips  
Yields 3 dozen

Combine flour and baking soda and set aside. Use an electric mixer to cream butter. Add vanilla and sugars, and beat until fluffy. Beat in egg. At low speed, beat in cocoa, then milk. With wooden spoon, mix in dry ingredients just until well-blended. Stir in nuts and chocolate chips.

Drop by rounded teaspoons onto non-stick or foil-lined baking sheets. Bake at 350 F for 12 to 13 minutes. Remove from oven and cool slightly before removing from baking sheets.

#### JOYOUS CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIES

3 cups flour  
1 tsp. baking soda  
1 tsp. salt  
1/2 cup butter  
1/4 cup shortening  
1/2 cup granulated sugar  
1 cup brown sugar, firmly packed  
1 tsp. vanilla extract  
2 eggs  
1 Tbs. milk  
3 Tbs. dark corn syrup  
12 ounces (2 cups) semi-sweet chocolate chips or one 12-ounce bar, cut in pieces  
1/2 cup pecans, broken  
Yields 4 dozen

Sift together flour, baking soda and salt, and set aside.

Cream butter and shortening together. Gradually add sugars and cream thoroughly. Mix together vanilla, eggs, milk and corn syrup and add to creamed mixture, beating until blended. Gradually add dry ingredients, mixing well. Add chocolate chips and nuts.

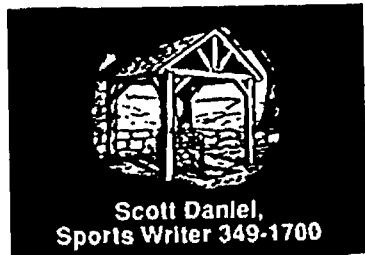

## Taylor leads Northville into hoop season

NHS has a new boys basketball coach.

Larry Taylor took the reins in July after serving as a freshman and junior varsity coach for the Mustangs since 1986. According to the new Northville resident, taking the job is like a dream come true.

"Every person involved in coaching would like to be a varsity coach," Taylor said, "and do things to help the program. We're going to try to develop the best student-athletes we can."

Omar Harrison retired after nine years as head coach last spring. He left the program with an 81-69 record, including a 10-11 mark in '91-'92.

"I've been at it a long time," Harrison said last summer. "After you reach a certain stage in life you don't have the amount of energy to give it as much. I felt like what needed to be done, I didn't have enough energy for, and I didn't want to cheat the kids. That wouldn't be fair."

After years at the high school, Northville Athletic Director Dennis Colligan said, Taylor had earned the chance to coach the varsity squad.

"He will be a positive influence," Colligan said in July. "He knows all

the kids, and we are very, very confident with him."

Taylor began his coaching career at Roseville after graduating from Eastern Michigan University in 1971. He piloted football, basketball and baseball squads for the Panthers.

The Marshall native took a job in the Northville Community School District in 1983 as a physical education teacher. Because of his work schedule, Taylor stayed away from coaching until 1986, when he took the Mustangs' freshman hoop slot.

"I like working with young kids," he said. "The best way to do that is through teaching and coaching."

"I never thought about (doing) anything else."

Taylor had success as Northville's JV coach. In the last few years, the Mustangs have had records of 14-6 and 16-5.

He said he focused on grooming players for varsity.

"I tried to teach the kids fundamentals," Taylor commented.

Coaching varsity is a different ball game, however.

"It's a definite learning process," Taylor said. "I don't think you realize what's going on till you do it. You're sheltered as a JV coach."

Running team camps, dealing

with college recruiters, scouts and the press has been among his new responsibilities, he added.

"It's time-consuming but fun," Taylor said. "It takes up a lot of my evenings. There's always mail to read and phone calls to return."

Although he has no personal goals for the coming season, he said there are plenty of team goals. Among those, Taylor said, his Mustangs want to finish over .500 and win the WLA Western Division.

Northville will place a fast-paced,

up-tempo style of basketball.

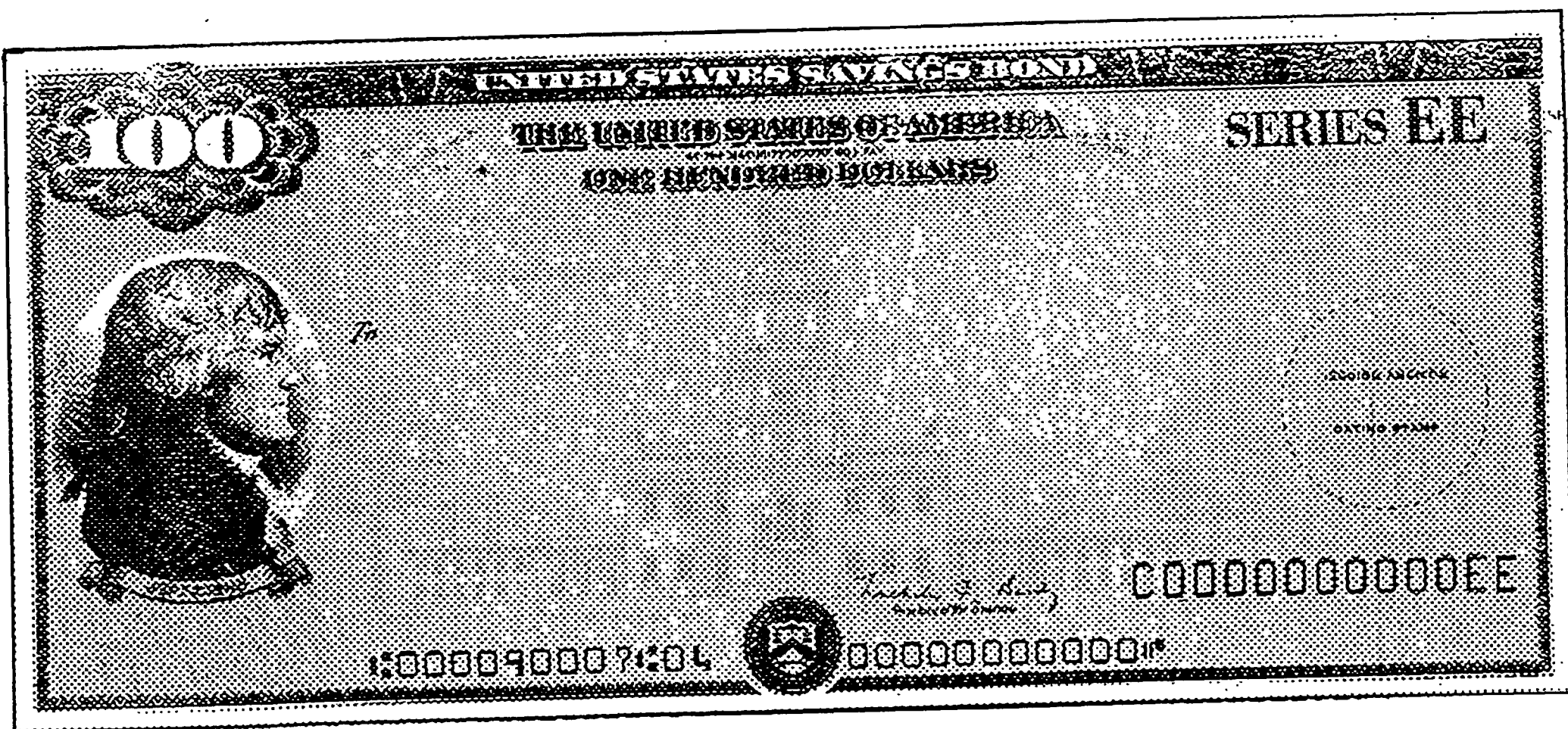
"We're trying not to make it work," he said. "We want to make it for them and for our fans."

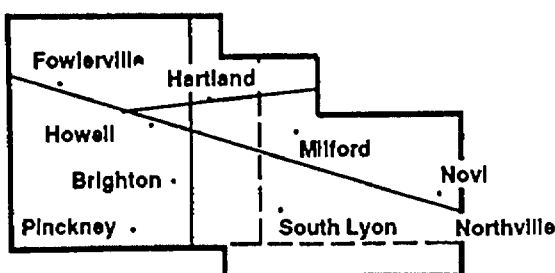

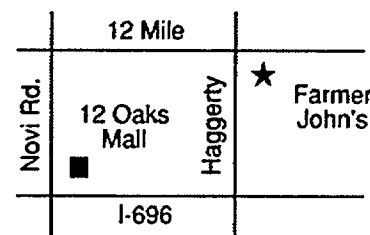

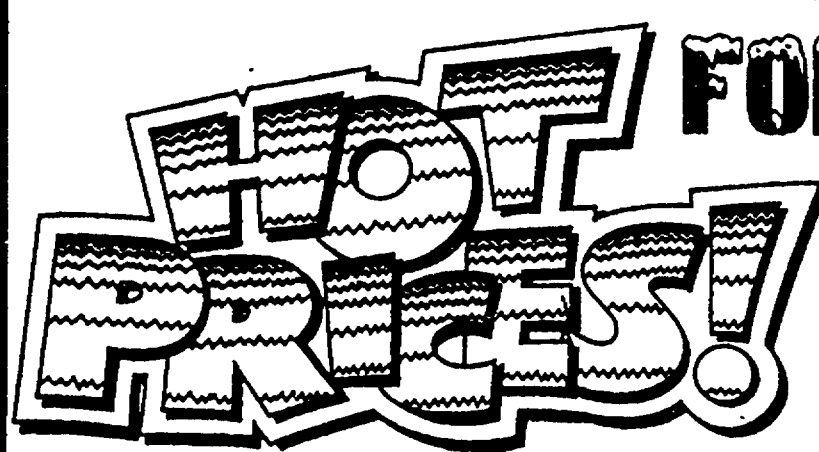

## Liza Minnelli: She'd make it anywhere

Both legacies have served the talented star well. After leaving home at age 16, Minnelli soon had a role in an off-Broadway show and won a Tony a year later for starring in *Flora, The Red Menace*. She broke house records in her nightclub debut at Washington, D.C.'s Shoreham Hotel and quickly found herself performing on television and in concert and nightclub bookings around the world.

Minnelli made her film debut in 1968's *Charlie Bubbles* and drew praise for her sensitive portrayals in *The Sterile Cuckoo* and *Tell Me That You Love Me, Junie Moon*. In 1972, she won the Best Actress Oscar for her work in *Cabaret* and picked up an Emmy for *Liza With a Z*.

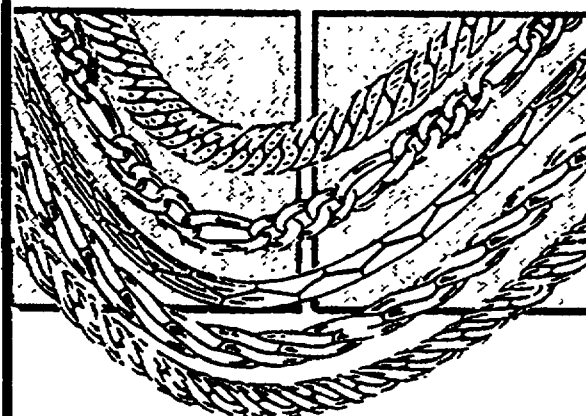

## a powerful indictment

### HBO chronicles Exxon Valdez oil spill

By Steven Alan McGaw

Moments after midnight on Friday, March 24, 1989, Exxon's oil tanker, The Valdez, ran aground on a reef in Alaska's Prince William Sound. The accident ruptured several of the ship's storage tanks and eventually spilled 11 million gallons of oil into the sea. Over 1,000 miles of previously pristine shoreline were affected and the impact on the area's wildlife was colossal, killing nearly 400,000 birds and thousands of fish and land animals. The most conservative scientific estimates say the true toll of the event will not be sufficiently appreciated until well into the next century.

On Saturday, Dec. 12, HBO unveils *Dead Ahead: The Exxon Valdez Disaster*, a dramatic chronicle of the event and its aftermath.

Christopher Lloyd stars as Frank Iarossi, an Exxon executive in charge of shipping. Within hours after the Valdez accident, Iarossi is awakened in his Houston home and

dispatched to Alaska to ensure the safe containment of the tanker's remaining oil and oversee Exxon's role in the massive cleanup. What follows, however, is day after day of finger-pointing, name-calling and argument, as Exxon, the Alyeska pipeline consortium, various environmentalist groups and even the Coast Guard squabble over who's to blame, who should do what and whose head(s) should roll.

*Dead Ahead* producer Leslie Woodhead says the real problem became shockingly clear as he and his staff did their 18 months of research. "What was going on," he says, "was an attempt on all parts to clean up their own image, rather than clean up the oil spill." The result, he charges, was a "devastating inertia" in mobilizing cleanup efforts, making the disaster far worse than it had to be.

John Heard co-stars as environmentalist Dan Lawn and David Morse plays outraged fisherman Rick Steiner. Rip Torn appears briefly as Adm. Paul Yost.

Each of the film's principals, as well as the supporting players and many extras, contributes to the film's urgency. Director Paul Seed keeps the story moving swiftly and makes effective use of archival footage of the actual event.

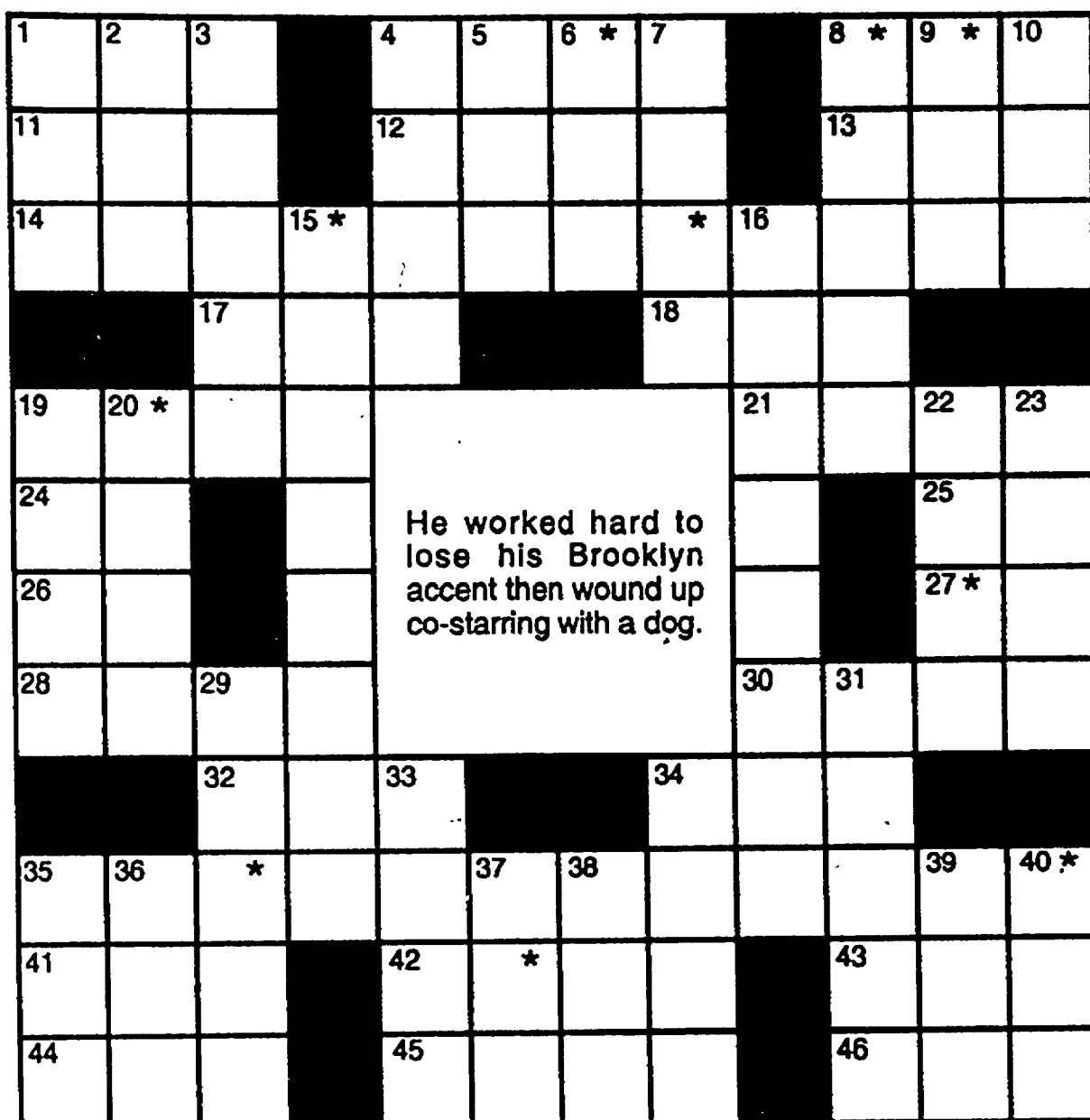

**Q:** I'm very interested in knowing a little about Woody Harrelson from Cheers and White Men Can't Jump. Is he really from Indiana? If so, is he from Hanover, like in Cheers? What are my chances of meeting him here in Indiana? Is there an address where I can write him? —Stacey Feazel, Peru, Ind.

**A:** Harrelson was born in Midland, Texas, but he was raised in Ohio, where he got his first taste of acting in a Lebanon High School drama class.

He then attended Hanover College in Indiana, where he appeared in more than two dozen stage productions before receiving a bachelor of arts degree and moving to New York. (It's surely no coincidence that his character hails from Hanover.)

The actor frequently tours with his band, Manly Moondog and the Three Kool Kats (they appeared on the ABC in Concert: Halloween Jam at Universal Studios special), and other than in a surprise speaking engagement at his alma mater, this is probably the best way to catch him in person. You may write Harrelson in care of Creative Artists Agency, 9830 Wilshire Blvd., Beverly Hills, Calif., 90212. Perhaps an inquiry as to his band's future play dates will reveal a location near you.

**Q:** I am a big fan of Shirley MacLaine. She is such a fine and diversified actress. I had a great time with my mother at her recent performance with Frank Sinatra at Radio City Music Hall. Could you please tell me where I can write to her? —Jessica Rith, Queens, New York.

**A:** It's true, the Metaphysical One (born Shirley MacLean Beatty — Warren's sis) is 58 and still shaking a leg with the best of them. You may write her in care of ICM, 8899 Beverly Blvd., Los Angeles, Calif., 90048.

**Q:** There used to be a show on television called Hardball. The characters' names were Charlie Battles and "Kaz." Can you please tell me what Kaz's full character name was? —Dana L. Gelfo, Mokena, Ill.

**A:** Richard Tyson played young, motorcycle-straddling cop Joe "Kaz" Kaczierowski to John Ashton's older Battles. The show first ran in the fall of 1989 and was "retooled" for another run in the summer of 1990, but it was canceled immediately afterward.

**Q:** I've been a fan of actor Powers Boothe for years. Would you be so kind as to tell me a little more about him and if CBS is going to show his movie Family of Spies again? —Richard Candler, High Point, N.C.

**A:** Boothe was born in 1949 in Snyder, Texas, and won a 1980 Emmy Award for his performance in Guyana Tragedy: The Story of Jim Jones. Boothe's other films include Emerald Forest, By Dawn's Early Light, A Breed Apart, A Cry for Love, The Plutonium Incident, Southern Comfort, Into the Homeland, Southern Double Cross and Extreme Prejudice. The two-part miniseries Family of Spies: The Walker Spy Ring, co-starring Lesley Ann Warren, could reappear on an independent TV station or perhaps on a network like USA. CBS has not announced any plans to rebroadcast it at this date. Keep an eye on your local listings.

**Q:** When I was younger I saw a movie called Little Abner. It was full of life, fun and music. I have been looking for it since that time and would now love for my kids to see it. Is it on video? —Diane Welty, Ingram, Texas.

**A:** Both the 1940 dramatic comedy and the 1959 musical comedy based on Al Capp's Dogpatch comic-strip characters are available on videotape, but only under the vernacular spelling of Li'l Abner. The slight difference in spelling may have thrown you off the trail at your video store.

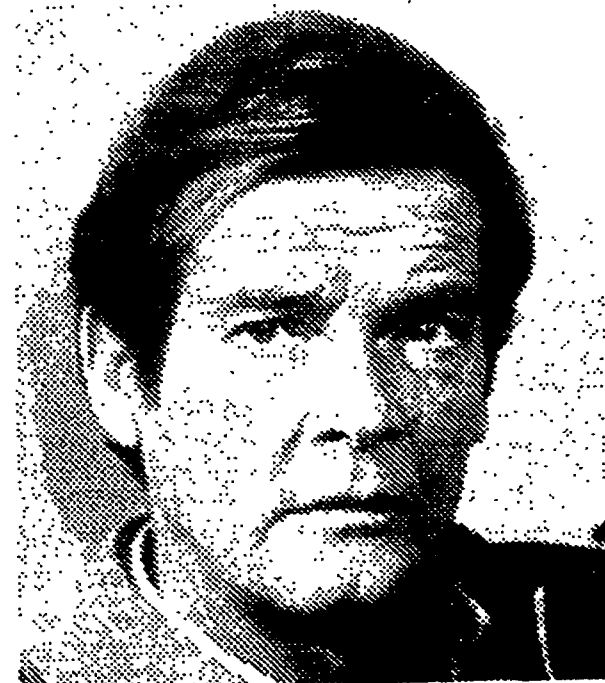
