Downtown advisors face off against council

A showdown is brewing among members of the recently appointed Citizens District Council.

The council was assembled in November to review the Downtown Development Authority's controversial Mainstreet '92 proposal.

But council members have been questioning what the scope of their group should be, and that debate continued at the CDC's second meeting in MainCentre's club room Wednesday night.

Because only four members of the nine-person council showed up, the meeting was an unofficial one and no action was taken. But the members did discuss what their role should be.

Chairman Jim DeHaan, who was appointed to head the council in his absence

during the first meeting, tried Wednesday to direct the group away from the financing aspect of the plan and toward a more narrow focus on the plan's impact on downtown residents.

DeHaan based his opinion on the state act that calls for a development area citizens council if 100 or more residents live within the DDA district. The act states that the citizens council "shall act as an advisory body to the authority and the governing body in the adoption of the development or tax increment financing plans . . . (and) shall notify the governing body, in writing, of its findings and recommendations concerning a proposed development plan."

"To me, that means that we should limit ourselves to how that plan impacts on people living in the area affected by the plan," DeHaan said.

He noted, too, the formation of the Northville Strategic Planning Group by Mayor

Chris Johnson to consider financing alternatives to Mainstreet '92. The plan to build an expanded Cady Street parking deck has drawn fire for its reliance on tax capturing from an expanded DDA district. The plan would continue the 15-year diversion of increased tax revenue embodied in Mainstreet '78 for another 20 years, diverting tax revenue from other taxing units like Northville Public Schools.

"It seems to me that since you've got the strategic planning group considering the financing plan, you've got the DDA considering alternatives . . . I don't see that we should get involved with why the schools feel the way they do."

Other CDC members were not so quick to relinquish that role.

"It's all tied in," argued CDC Member DeHephine Dudick. "We're not really going to have any input into the financial plan, but is there anything wrong with knowing about it?"

Member Mary Wedenoja agreed, saying, "Eventually we'll have to get to this (financing issue), because evidently this is the big question."

John Crete noted that he believed the CDC would consider all aspects of Mainstreet '92 when he joined the group, but that the strategic planning group has taken over part of that role.

"Our goal now, the way I see it, is not to change anything in Mainstreet '92 but to determine how it will impact the 130 or so residents in the DDA district," he said. "In a way I'm kind of relieved . . . That burden has been relieved of us."

Crete added that the strategic planning group, with members from the city, township and school system, "are probably a better body to look at the financing issue than we are."

Irene Fleming, a parent and member of

Advocates for Quality Education, asked the CDC to make its intention clear when it issues its findings on the plan.

"You have to work out your own purpose and your own focus, but if you choose not to focus on the finances then you should make that clear to the public," she said. "Otherwise, I fear it is misleading to the public."

Whatever the CDC's eventual role, the members agreed that downtown residents should be polled to determine their reaction to Mainstreet '92. "I don't know how much interest there would be among these people, but I think it's only fair to find out," DeHaan said.

The CDC's next meeting has been scheduled for Jan. 20 at 7:30 p.m. in the MainCentre building. The meetings are open to the public.

Schools change honors standard

It's back to the drawing board for members of the Northville Board of Education's curriculum subcommittee.

Earlier this year, the board decided to review its high school graduation honors designations because it felt its valedictorian and salutatorian standards were too rigid.

Assistant Superintendent for Instructional Services Dolly McMaster said the change was needed because students were not "seeking risks" by experimenting with subjects other than what they excelled in for fear of lowering their grade point average. The new system will allow for a "B" if a student chooses a subject outside his or her strength area or in an elective class.

"To divert the program, students would take a less difficult course," Thomas Johnson, Northville High School principal, explained. "This will create a wider band so we can celebrate more students than just a certain top few."

When the curriculum subcommittee agreed on grade point average ranges at a Nov. 18 meeting, it still couldn't reach a decision on how to label them.

Last Monday, the board of education decided to table the issue until its Jan. 11 meeting, after members disagreed with the subcommittee's suggestions for three levels of honor designations. The suggestions were: "scholar" for students attaining a 3.8 to 4.0 grade point average; "honor" for points ranging from 3.0 to 3.49; and "magna cum laude" for those earning averages of 2.5 to 3.79.

In a drafted letter to parents and students of the class of 1996, however, honor designations were as follows: "summa cum laude" for 3.8 and higher grade point averages; "magna cum laude" for 3.5 to 3.79 grade points; and "honor" for averages in the 3.0 to 3.49 area.

Board secretary Richard Brown Jr. opposed the use of "summa cum laude" as a designation for grade points of 3.8.

"You diminish summa cum laude by putting it with 3.8," Brown told board members. "It's a traditional

Township to review BFI tap-in pact

Browning-Ferris Industries came knocking at the township's door last Thursday with a check in hand and a pipe dream.

The waste hauler had hoped the board would accept its check and give it permission to tap into the township's sewer line.

Swan Harbour rapist gets 15-40 years

A former maintenance man for Swan Harbour Apartments was sentenced to 15-40 years in jail for raping a Northville Township woman earlier this year.

Ronald Dale Johnson, 28, was to immediately begin serving his sentence with the Michigan Department of Corrections after pleading guilty to three counts of criminal sexual conduct and one count of burglary before Detroit Recorder's Court Judge Prentis Edwards last Tuesday.

At approximately 5 a.m. April 8, Johnson reportedly entered the apartment of a 24-year-old woman at Swan Harbour. Police believe Johnson used a copy of a pass key and some type of wire cutting tool to slice a door chain. It was reported in April editions of *The Northville Record* that the suspect entered the sleeping woman's bedroom and jumped on her waterbed. The woman awakened and screamed and reportedly a struggle ensued as the man attempted to cover her mouth.

The woman was bound with duct tape by her hands and ankles and repeatedly raped, according to reports. A tape-covered pillow had also been allegedly wrapped around the woman's face.

The victim told police the man had

threatened to kill her and her young child, who was in the apartment at the time of the incident, and reportedly rubbed a long-bladed knife along her body during the assault.

After the assault, Johnson fell asleep in another apartment. After a couple hours of sleep, he saw no police activity near the scene and left the Northville area with \$20 in his pocket. He drove to a relative's home in Holland, Mich., where he reportedly secured another \$70.

Johnson was arrested April 10 near a Florida rest area in Leon County by Florida Highway Patrol officers for driving with a suspended license. It was then Johnson reportedly confessed to raping a 24-year-old Northville Township woman. He also reportedly told police where to find the weapon used in the attack and officers later located a large steak knife in the toilet tank of the victim's apartment.

The victim told police Johnson once helped her move furniture in the apartment. In a tape recorded 911 call to police, the victim told a police dispatcher she thought she recognized her attacker, though during the attack Johnson reportedly wore a white fishnet-type stocking over his head.

School officials want right to inspect cars

Two policy revisions were debated during the routine policy considerations portion of last Monday night's Northville Board of Education meeting.

The first policy, Inspection of Student Lockers-Desks-Automobiles, caused some discussion because the revision now allows school personnel to inspect desks and automobiles in addition to student lockers.

"I don't know how you can expand that to automobiles," said one member of the audience. "I think you're skating on thin ice."

Robert Somson, executive direc-

tor of special education, said students will have to sign a form allowing for their cars to be entered during school hours or functions, before they will be granted a parking permit.

The only reason school personnel may enter and inspect an automobile, desk or locker, is to protect the health, safety or welfare of the building and/or students. School personnel may seize alcohol, tobacco, controlled substances, weapons, other dangerous instruments or stolen property if found and may use it as evidence in suspension, expulsion or legal action.

"This doesn't allow us to open a car

Site condo rules passed by planners

The planning commission is tying up an apparent loophole in the city's zoning ordinances, and now needs the city council to pull the knot tight. The commission approved a site condominium ordinance Tuesday that regulates the relatively new type of development, following a vacant public hearing. The ordinance must be passed by the council before it takes effect.

Site condominiums are a new type of land conveyance with similarities to both traditional condominium developments and subdivisions. As with condominiums, purchasers of site condos only own the land on which their unit sits, and common areas in the complex are available to all within the complex. But as in subdivisions, the condo dwellers have exclusive rights to an area of land immediately around their units.

The site condo concept can be applied to any zoning, but is most often used for single-family residential developments.

The new ordinance was first proposed by the city's planning consultant, Don Wortman. It would treat site condos like typical subdivisions, with the same setback requirements and allowable building densities.

Wortman noted that the commission would never get to review a

single-family residential site condominium development under current city law, because no section of city law covers site condos.

"There's a loophole that I'm trying to close," he said. "If there's an R-1 (single family residential) development, you would never see it. . . You would not have an opportunity to review the road configuration, lot configuration, you wouldn't be able to see which trees are going to be removed or where sidewalks would be placed, or anything like that as the law stands now," Wortman said.

The state law governing site condominiums is no help from a planning perspective either, Wortman noted, because it focuses on the commercial transaction issues involved rather than land use issues.

Not all the commissioners were convinced by Wortman's presentation.

"I guess I don't have much confidence (in the proposal)," said Commissioner David Totten.

Totten wondered whether the site condominium ordinance was simply an attempt to avoid future city involvement in disputes like the recently ended one at St. Lawrence Estates. The condominium owners there charged the developer with failing to abide by the city-approved site plan, and criticized the city for failing to enforce the plan.

But Wortman noted that St. La-

wrence was a typical condominium complex, not a site condominium, and that its site plan was in fact reviewed by the commission.

The commission eventually voted 5-1 to recommend that the council approve the ordinance addition, with Totten casting the no vote.

want to know when the township was approached and by whom.

"Our main interest is to be as educated as we can be."

Handside wanted to get the ball rolling on the signed contract last week by paying the first installments of \$265,000 in capital connection fees and \$65,000 in compensation to the township. Both payment schedules were outlined in contract negotiations which led up to the signing of

the contract on July 31, 1992 by Handside and former Township Supervisor Betty Lennox.

The contract affords BFI capacity in the Western Township's Utilities Authority's sewer line to pump leachate — a landfill by-product — through the line. In exchange for the capacity in the line BFI agreed to pay the township a total of \$1.3 million in connection fees, four annual payments of \$65,000 in compensation, and provide township residents with 48 months of free curbside recycling.

Schools place high in contest

Two Northville schools scored well in the 1992 All-School Winter Knowledge Open held recently.

Meads Mill and Cooke middle schools placed fifth and seventh, respectively, out of 50 participating Michigan middle schools in the all-school competition. Out of 1,379 middle schools participating internationally, Meads Mill ranked 103rd and Cooke came in at 137.

A company in Colorado sponsors the contest, which quizzes students in categories of math, social studies, history and trivia. Schools are provided with a computer disk and a team of students answer questions on the computer. Points are awarded based on speed and accuracy.

Each school has two teams, an all-school team, which recently competed, and a sixth-grade team. The sixth-grade team will compete in January and March, while the all-school team will have a chance to better its score with another competition in April. Each team is made up of 17 students.

Sue Spaniol, media specialist at Cooke Middle School, coaches the Cooke teams.

"The exciting part about it is you can't prepare," Spaniol said. "The only preparations we have is talking about the strategies and things we can do to work as a team."

Out of 2,000 possible points, the Cooke all-school team scored 1,529

points after answering 200 multiple choice questions. The average score based on all participating middle schools was 1,300.

The Meads Mill team, coached by Robert Stover, earned 1,548 total points. Woman caught with stolen card at craft show

A 27-year-old Detroit woman was arrested by city police for credit card fraud Dec. 13, after she tried to buy gifts at a local craft show. The woman tried to use a Visa credit card to purchase several items at a craft show at the Northville Recreation Center, but the card was reported stolen. When city police questioned the woman, she claimed to be the woman named on the credit card but said she had no other identification. Police asked her to check her purse for more identification and she pulled out a Fredrick's of Hollywood receipt that bore the same name as the credit card. But a police officer noticed a prescription bottle in her purse and asked her to take it out, and it was made out to a different woman. The suspect said the medication came from a friend. The officer then asked to see the woman's wallet, and found a driver's license with the

woman's picture and the same name as the medication. At that point, she was placed under arrest. The next day, the woman admitted to taking the Visa and a Montgomery Ward credit card from her landlord's mail after the landlord died. The Montgomery Ward card had almost \$6,700 in charges against it. The woman said she used the Visa to buy teddy bears, baskets, pine cone ornaments, a Christmas tree and two wreaths from the Northville craft show, and said she also bought several items at a Novi High School craft show the previous day. **TRUCK STOLEN:** A \$30,000 pickup truck was reported stolen from the parking lot south of Main Centre Dec. 17. The truck's owner discovered it missing at 8:30 a.m. The pickup was described as a green GMC

Typhoon with grey bottom panel. The owner had only had the vehicle for one day when it was stolen. **DRIVER SERIOUSLY INJURED:** A 35-year-old Farmington woman was seriously injured in a three-car accident occurring Dec. 16 on Seven Mile. A vehicle driven by a Redford woman and another vehicle driven by a Farmington Hills woman were waiting in the westbound lane to turn left into the Northville Plaza. A pickup truck driven by a third woman from Farmington failed to stop, hitting the Redford woman's car from behind. The impact of the collision pushed the Redford woman's car into the vehicle in front of hers. The pickup driver, who was transported to St. Mary Hospital, was cited for failing to stop within an assured clear distance and for not wearing a

Administrator puts friendly face on special ed

Bob Somson pointed to an array of forms stacked neatly on several shelves in his office. As executive director of special education for Northville Public Schools, Somson admitted he has learned to live with the rules and regulations governing special education, but said he can go one step better than just filing forms. "Frankly, my goal is to find a way to humanize that process," Somson said. "Special education was set up in a well-intended way, but in some respects has gone too far in creating too many rules, too much of a bureaucracy. What's best for the kids doesn't necessarily run into the rules." In February, Somson will observe his first year on the job at Northville. Before coming here, he served as a special education supervisor, representing 11 school districts, for the Jackson County Intermediate School District. "I like my job very well," Somson said. "I like about 85 percent of it." The 15 percent part he doesn't like about his job stems from the millage defeat this year. Somson said he didn't like having to watch programs, which many worked hard to establish, being cut. Although almost every kindergarten through 12th grade special education program is mandated, the cuts in general education did affect the special education program, according to Somson. "To do a good job in special education, you have to do a good job entirely," he said. "Most of the special

Parent involvement spurs projects

Although many more elements make up the special education program for Northville Public Schools, there are a few special programs Bob Somson can't help boasting about. Two programs in particular, Kids on the Block and Family Support Network, are projects of the Parent Advisory Council (PAC), a small group of parent volunteers representing special education children within the district. Kids on the Block uses puppets to help explain "differences" to elementary children. The puppet demonstration is primarily for the fourth graders," Somson said. "It allows kids to ask questions about puppets who are handicapped. The puppets represent all sorts of handicaps. The kids really like it. The teachers really like it, too." The Family Support Network is in its beginning stages, according to Naomi Brandon, who oversees the project. The network, which is in its beginning stages, matches parents who have special needs children with the same impairments. "I get calls quite often from parents who are

distressed," Brandon said. "All they need is someone to talk to. Sometimes they need information." Brandon learned about the Family Support Network through a friend's reference and later from some literature she received through the mail. "I just found out there is an active group in Novi," she said. "We're hoping to take our community and put them together." Based in Detroit, the network helps disseminate information and hosts seminars. "They had a seminar last summer on how we can have the right type of insurance," Brandon stated as an example. "It is a very helpful group." Another PAC member, Linda Clark, also keeps the committee up on the latest information by serving as a representative on the Wayne County PAC. "It means going to a meeting once a month and getting information on everything that's happening [related to special education] in the county," Clark said. "Sometimes we have different speakers from individual school districts. We learn different things about the way special education is mandated."

Clark said her role as representative is just one more way for parents to network. "We [PAC] are there for anyone in the community who has a child with any type of need," Clark said. "(The child) could be very minimal to those more severely impaired." "Sometimes as parents we feel we're in this by ourselves. We don't know there are other people here with the same problems. The more people we have [join the PAC], the more ideas we'll have." Brandon said she felt it was an honor to be a part of the PAC. "I feel it's a very active program," she said. "We've done a lot of good things. It helps me to keep up on new laws. If I was not active, then I wouldn't be aware of them. Being involved makes me aware of what's going on." Clark, who teaches special education in Northville, said she was a parent before she was a teacher in the district. She bases her impression of Northville's special education program on her parenting experience. "I think the district is very responsive to meeting the students' needs," she said.

"They serve in a couple of capacities," Somson explained. "They give me good feedback information on our programs and their concerns as parents. In addition to that, we put them to work as much as we can with reviewing plans and proposals." Currently, the parent advisory council is studying attention deficit disorders. Other items on the special education agenda include creating more learning experiences related to real-life situations, like on-the-job training for high school special education students, and individualizing planning for all special education students. "Sometimes, the federal guidelines are not good enough for us," Somson said. "It's too much of a legalistic, formal process which intimidates parents. We're more open to the parents." The PAC meets five times a year. Parents on the committee have volunteered to serve and have committed themselves to being available to other parents in the community. "It [the PAC] is extremely important," Somson said. "It would be very easy, particularly in this day and age when we're so busy and have too many things on our plate, not to get involved." "Good feedback from the community is absolutely necessary. The fact that these people are willing to volunteer their time and make presentations — I think it's pretty darn nice of them."

SEMCOG keeps counties on board

Livingston and Monroe counties will be included in a regional plan to reduce dirt in the air 15 percent by 1996. The Southeast Michigan Council of Governments executive committee Friday decided to gear the plan to all seven counties rather than leave out the two small ones. "Data at this point indicate those two counties contribute 6 to 8 percent of the total mobile source emissions," said Milton Mack, a Wayne County probate judge who chairs SEMCOG's air quality task force. "Further, approximately two-thirds of the travel originating in those counties passes through the other counties in the region. A seven-county program appears appropriate based on currently avail-

able data." Deleting any counties, Mack said, would mean even more cleanup in the remaining counties — Oakland, Wayne, Macomb, St. Clair and Washtenaw. Livingston County officials, such as drain commissioner Richard Rudnicki, made no comment on the plan. There was no argument as officials from the regional approved outlines for complying with the federal Clean Air Act amendments of 1990. The region's goal is to reduce air emissions 15 percent from the 1990 level by 1996. Failure to meet the federal goal could mean the region would lose transportation money, industrial building permits and control over designing its own compliance plan. In extreme cases, local officials could be held personally liable for failing to clean up dirty air.

"Final action needs to be taken in January," Mack told the SEMCOG panel. "The plan must be submitted to the federal government by November of 1993." The first cleanup plan drivers could see would be vapor recovery devices on fuel pumps. They would reduce volatile organic compounds (VOCs) by 4 percent. Second would be more stringent vehicle emissions tests administered by a central agency rather than the local service station. Third likelihood is "reformulated" fuel that would be a few cents per gallon more costly than present rates. Mack chaired a task force with members from the oil industry, auto makers, utilities, county governments, road commissions, universities and environmental groups.

Light up your tree without lighting a fire

Every year, thousands of families throughout Michigan brighten the holidays with brilliantly lit Christmas trees and other assorted home decorations. Christmas trees, however, are more than a festive tradition; they are also a potential fire hazard. Following are some simple fire precautions that should be taken to help ensure a safe and happy holiday season for you and your family. While this is not a complete list of potential problems, it will provide a basic awareness of some of the most common Christmas tree fire hazards.

1. When you get your tree home, make a fresh cut in the trunk and keep plenty of water in the tree stand at all times. Most stands have reservoirs for this purpose.
2. Place your tree in a location that is away from fireplaces, heaters or other sources of flame.
3. Use heat vent deflectors to force hot air away from your tree. Hot air will dry your tree prematurely and make it more susceptible to fire.
4. Check light strands for open sockets and cracked or frayed cords. If any of these light conditions exist, replace the lights.
5. Do not overload your electrical outlets with too many lights. This can cause an electrical arc, leading to an outlet fire.
6. Be sure that all decorative lighting is turned off whenever you leave your home.
7. Never use lit candles on or near your tree.
8. If you burn candles in your house, keep them in sight at all

9. Be aware of children and pets playing near your tree. The tree could be knocked over, resulting in injury, fire or other damage.
 10. Check tree needles to make sure they are not dry or brittle. If they are, or if needles are falling, remove the tree from your home.
 11. When disposing of your tree after the holidays, never burn it in your fireplace.
 12. Inspect your home fire extinguisher and know how to use it.
 13. Test your home smoke detector. It can be a lifesaver in event of a home fire.
- Remember, awareness and precaution are the best ways to prevent an accidental home fire. These tips simply provide a basic guideline to help you create a safer environment for your family during the holiday season. standard of excellence. Do not diminish that."

The only other school district in the area that uses summa cum laude for a 3.8 or higher grade point distinction is Wayne-Westland, according to a review of over 25 high schools conducted by the high school admin-

istration. Livonia Stevenson, Franklin and Churchill awarded summa cum laude status for students graduating with a 3.95 or more while Brighton and Berkley school districts use the title for students with 4.0 grade point averages only.

"Titles are not all that important," said Jean Hansen, trustee.

Hansen suggested the board approve the grade point ranges and let the high school administration determine titles.

Several board members disagreed, however, and felt the subcommittee should re-evaluate its findings.

"The point here is we need to do something now," Joseph Dunkerley Jr., trustee, said. "The kids (this will affect) are not knowing what we're doing."

While Baja offered no specific charges against the Plymouth-based law firm's performance, she said she owed it to the voters who elected her and the new board to at least look into who else was on the market.

"We are looking to see if there's someone else out there who can do a better job," she said. "That firm has come under criticism from the press and from township residents."

"I think the voters made a statement by bringing in a new board and we must be willing to at least go out for proposals on this issue."

After bids are received, Baja said she and a committee of three will sit down and interview the bidders and make a recommendation to the township board. Representing the township on that committee will be Clerk Sue Hillebrand, Trustee Russ Fogg, who will represent the Planning Commission, and Donald Samhat from the Zoning Board of Appeals.

"We are trying to get those to attend who use the legal services the most to sit in on the interviewing," Baja said.

Baja said she was expecting about 15 firms to submit bids including Sills, Hemming, Law, Essad, Polaczyk & Gillary, which has counseled the township since 1987.

New plan tightens math program

The Northville Board of Education plugged up the holes in its math curriculum by approving a new one Dec. 14, which aligns itself with the Public Act 25 core curriculum.

Betty Parker, a Northville math, science and health resource teacher, headed up the alignment project, beginning almost two years ago, with a committee of teachers including Pat Baird, Judy Higbee, Cheryl Holmberg, Jan Janigan, Wendy Kelly, Bonnie Knight, Virginia Kricitz, Bill Lenz, Judy Mach, Martha Satori, Darrel Schumacher, Kathy Stutterheim and Cheryl Walro.

The committee developed a four-part process; the first step was establishing a core grid.

the committee," Parker told board members during a presentation.

The committee then took the grids and marked whether or not the district taught the curriculum.

"If we accomplished it we would mark it down. If not we would leave the (grid) blank," Parker said. "Then

we went back and identified where the holes were.

"We found we were very strong in everything in the area of elementary (math) except in algebra. We weren't dealing with it well (because) we weren't using the more modern terminology. In the sixth grade through high school we found statistics and

probability were the missing pieces." The next step was to communicate those identified strengths and weaknesses with the teachers. Hence, another part of the phase, a Scope and Sequence chart was formed. This allowed the committee to add back any objective that was either missing or needed changing because of new terminology standards.

The PA 25 core curriculum also requires math, science, language arts and world studies be integrated with subjects such as career and employability outcomes, technology and life management. So, the committee also developed an integration grid used to represent alignment in the above areas.

"I'm not into reinventing the wheel," Parker said of the integration grid. "I went into this with the thought in mind, that by having all the integrated outcomes for all the different contents, this grid will always be in place."

that is locked," Somson said. "If a student refuses, then he can lose his parking privileges."

Somson added the district's attorney suggested the board adopt two policies — one dealing with inspections of lockers, desks and automobiles and another one dealing with confiscation procedures. The board requested Somson look into the split policy in time for a possible amendment to the second reading of the policy in January.

The board also held the first reading of a new policy dealing with student publications. Although the policy refers to all publications, it primarily deals with the content of student newspapers. It requires students to treat staff and students with respect and courtesy when writing an article or editorial about them.

Vice president of the board Glenna Davis had a minor problem with the policy's guideline of establishing the building principal in each respective

school building as the "publisher" for all student publications.

"There's nothing in here about what else a student can do if the publisher makes an arbitrary decision," Davis said. "What recourse do the students have? I think you could be discouraging some very creative thinking."

"If the policy is too restrictive, an underground newspaper might start and there will be no control," Joseph Dunkerley Jr., trustee, agreed.

Davis requested an appeal procedure be investigated and possibly instituted in the policy.

Other policies revised by the board included:

- Student Attendance-Zone Assignment. The only addition to this policy was the statement, "Parents may request outside for their child in a school outside their zone of attendance in compliance with the Northville Public Schools open enrollment procedures."
- Communicable Diseases which

are Spread by Bloodborne Pathogens. The policy defines communicable diseases spread by bloodborne pathogens and establishes guidelines for school attendance. If a student or staff member is known to have a communicable disease or infection that is known not to be spread by casual contact, like AIDS-HIV or Hepatitis B, the infected staff member or student will be allowed to remain in the school setting, after the case is reviewed by an advisory team. The advisory team may include the school nurse, subject's physician, public health personnel, the student's parents or guardian and personnel associated with the proposed educational setting.

If, however, the student or staff member poses a risk or health threat to others, according to appropriate medical professionals, he or she could be excluded from the school setting, according to the policy.

The revised policy meets federal and state mandated guidelines, ac-

ording to Richard H. Brown, secretary of the board.

- Student Code of Conduct. The revised student code of conduct is a shorter version of the previous one. Instead of naming the penalties for violating each prohibited act listed, the board simply chose to state, "penalties may range from administration intervention to expulsion." The preamble of the code of conduct was also shortened.

- Student Dress and Grooming. There was no change in this policy, which requires students to adhere to the "general policy of being clean, not distracting in style or design, and adhering to good health standards."

- The final policy, Ninth Semester Probation Students" was also untouched. The policy simply states students may be admitted for a ninth semester upon the recommendation of the building principal, however, will be placed on probation and expected to maintain passing grades in all subjects.

Strategic committee should stick to plan

The recently appointed Northville Strategic Planning Group was recently asked to broaden its focus to include school and library funding needs as well as the funding mechanism for the embattled Mainstreet '92 plan.

While we understand the reasoning behind the request, we believe broadening the ad-hoc committee's focus at this point would be a mistake.

The nine-member strategic planning group was empaneled by Mayor Chris Johnson in November to review the controversial tax increment financing plan embodied in Mainstreet '92, and consider alternative funding methods. The move was a wise attempt on Johnson's part to bring together the various business and school groups that have understandably differing views on the best way to fund the near-\$7 million project.

But sitting the factions down at the same table was one thing — convincing them to agree on a compromise may well be another.

Enter Advocates for Quality Education member Joan Wadsworth. She suggested during the planning group's first meeting that it review Mainstreet '92 in conjunction with Northville Public Schools' financial situation and the possibility of a district library millage request early next year.

The schools' tight finances already have become an issue for the group, and will continue to be so given the nature of the opposition to Mainstreet '92. But while it may make sense to consider all three funding needs at some point, Mainstreet '92 is the only fully formed proposal at this point, flawed as it may be.

Trying to tackle all three issues at once would also be a daunting task, especially when the most fully realized of the three is still in such a state of flux.

The financing proposal for Mainstreet '92 will likely go through several more revisions before it wins approval from a majority of the city's residents, but that process has already begun with a proposal from DDA Member Greg Presley. The process should continue until a plan is reached that can be judged on its own merits.

Wadsworth also called for an in-depth review of the DDA proposal itself, including the size of the proposed three-level deck. That suggestion may have been a good one months or years ago when the deck was first proposed, but the city has since spent upwards of \$200,000 on engineering work and land acquisition and the resulting plan makes good sense from an engineering standpoint.

The three-level deck cannot be shortened any more, according to its engineers, because that would increase the slope of the internal ramps to unacceptable levels. Because the deck is built into the hillside, its top floor is level with Mary Alexander Court as is the current Cady Street structure, so there is no extra floor to remove.

Also, as City Manager Gary Word pointed out in a recent DDA meeting, the deck does nothing more than replace parking in the current Cady deck, meet MainCentre's parking requirements and meet the parking needs of the proposed CadyCentre and Long buildings. That hardly seems like an excessive amount of parking to expect from a deck that should last 30-40 years.

And the current proposal has not been drawn up behind closed doors. Every DDA and city council discussion on the plan (and there have been dozens over the years) has been in open session except those dealing with land acquisition. The meetings have been advertised in the Record, and dozens of newspaper articles and several illustrations have followed the deck design's evolution from a structure dedicated largely to the MainCentre project on Center Street to a greatly expanded structure on Cady, to its present three-story, 480-space size.

If ever an issue has been explored in detail, this one has. Every development plan will have its opponents, but at some point the plan must be judged on its merits by the entire community.

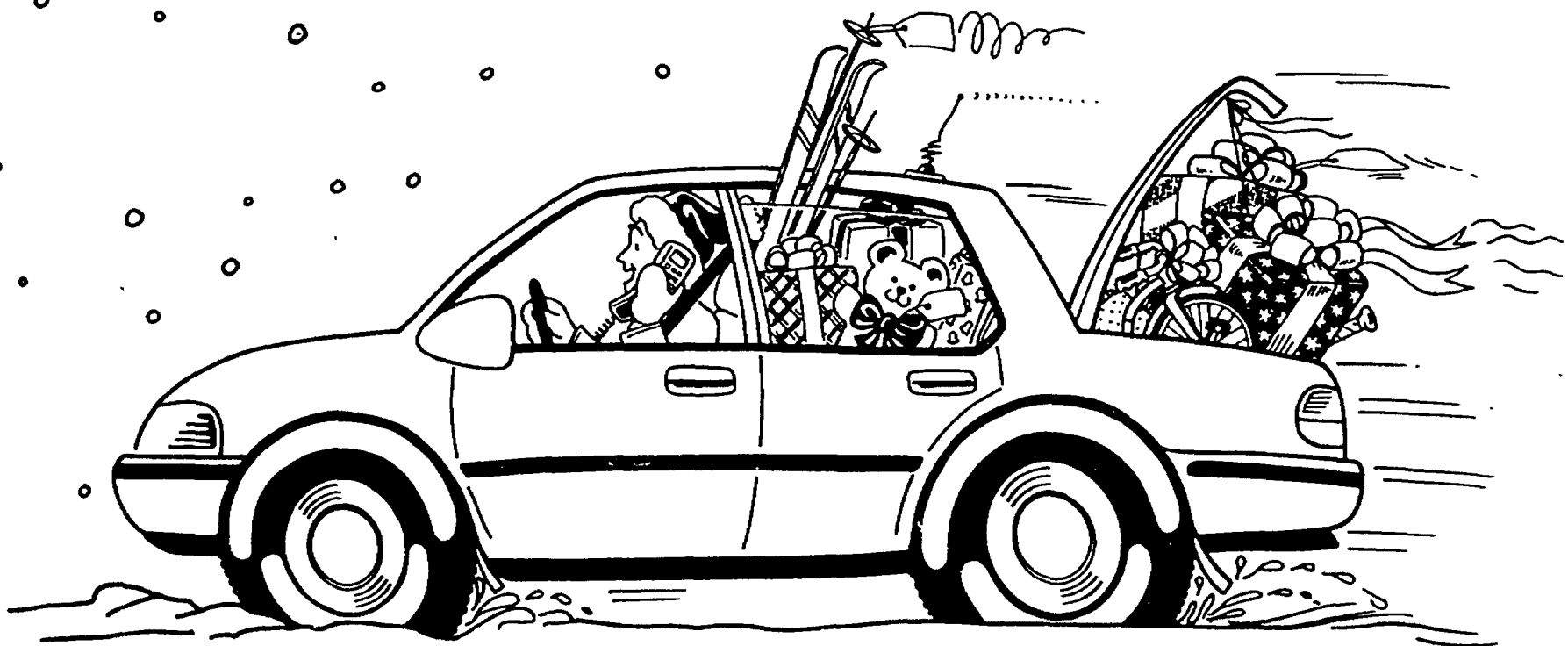

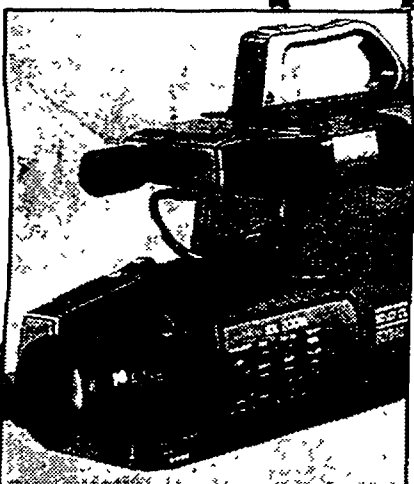

Don't give in to holiday food temptations

Defend yourself, fruitcake on one side, egg nog on the other, festive treats of the seasons everywhere, you have to be strong!

Holidays present something of a dilemma for health conscious people. Special occasions deserve special foods but holiday foods are notorious for being laden with calories and fat. Somewhere between Thanksgiving and New Year's the average person gains about 6 pounds. Then comes the struggle to diet and exercise back down to size. The best idea is to stick to a regular exercise program during the holidays, hold down the calories and learn what foods to eat rather than eating what you shouldn't.

Turkey makes an excellent low-fat, low calorie meat. To keep the calories low, remove the skin, that cuts calories by about 20 percent. Don't stuff the turkey, as the bread absorbs the fat from the bird, and elevate the bird on a roasting rack so it doesn't sit in the fat. Baste with wine, fruit juice or clear broth rather than the drippings.

If you consume 2,000 calories a day, you should eat no more than 66 grams of fat to keep to the 30 percent daily recommendation. To find the percentage of calories derived from fat, multiply the grams of fat by 9, then divide by the total calories and then multiply by 100 to get the percentage. Some food labels do the arithmetic for you, or clip this out so you can do nutritional analysis of a recipe in a magazine or book quickly.

When making a fruitcake, or other baked sweets, use dried fruit instead of candied fruit. Skip the egg yolk when you can, as it accounts for 60 of an egg's 77 calories. When sauteing, instead of butter, use a non-stick skillet spray that is either made from vegetable or olive oil.

Instead of candied sweet potatoes, bake sweet potatoes and you can save over 100 calories. After baking, mash them with orange juice and garnish with orange slices or pineapple. Baked acorn squash will add only 69 calories per one-half cup. If you don't want to use sweet potatoes, homemade turkey gravy contains about 71 calories per fourth cup while dry mix turkey gravy is only 22 calories per fourth cup.

If you have a sweet tooth but need to limit sugar and fat in your diet (they contribute to high blood cholesterol as well as extra pounds), here are a few suggestions. Fruit flavored sorbet and fruity ices contain no fat compared to 50 to 75 percent of the fat calories in ice cream. Many fresh fruits satisfy a sweet tooth with no added fat. A bread and jam treat has only a trace of fat. For a lower fat pie crust, use crushed graham crackers moistened with fruit juices and then baked.

Bolster your energy during the holiday rush in the mall. Good low-fat snack choices would be soft pretzels, plain popcorn, low-fat frozen yogurt cones, low-fat milk shakes, bagels or dried fruit. A vegetable pizza, a plain baked potato, grilled chicken sandwich (no sauce and no breading) are also quick and easy pick up for those shopping days.

Look for low-fat recipes for egg nog and limit the amount of alcohol. (No "raw-egg" egg nog for food safety reasons!)

Make small switches to reduce fat, calories and cholesterol while still satisfying your holiday appetite. Substitute a plain bagel for a croissant to save 35 calories; one tablespoon evaporated skim milk whipped can be used instead of whipping cream to save 32 calories; one ounce of roasted chestnuts instead of one ounce oil roasted peanuts to save 96 calories; one ounce of thin pretzels substituted for one ounce potato chips saves 40 calories; and one tablespoon bottled salsa substituted for one tablespoon sour cream dip saves 20 calories.

A Crystallized Idea

Schoolcraft ice-carvers taking shape

Something was different here. Traditional chef's hats and coats had been traded in for wool caps and ski jackets. The tools of choice were not whisks and measuring cups, but electric chain saws and steel chisels.

The occasion was what one participant called a "road trip," for students in Chef Dan Hugelger's ice-carving class from Schoolcraft College. About a dozen culinary students braved plummeting temperatures to fashion and assemble a crystalline work of art on the front lawn of Rocky's of Northville on Seven Mile Road.

This is actually the first of two such public displays, Hugelger said. The students will also take part in next month's Plymouth Ice Festival, which draws ice-carving professionals from around the Midwest.

The activity Thursday created a rather peculiar scene at Rocky's. In the background a generator clattered away while floodlights illuminated the scene. The grinding of chainsaws, the intense activity and the boisterous laughter of the students appeared in stark contrast to the sedate diners who oohed and aahed from just behind the windows of the restaurant.

The students measured blocks, marked their cuts, and chipped away with saws and chisels. Then gingerly they piled the various pieces in place, using slush like filler putty to fill the gaps.

Onlookers were left with the impression that what was going on here was as much carpentry as it was art.

As with any carpentry job, planning is important. One student demonstrated so by pulling out the blueprints for the team project. They revealed two platforms on a table, supported by columns and topped with a huge, six-piece fan.

Beside the table were an angel perched atop a smaller platform. On the other side, another platform with "Merry Christmas" artfully carved into it.

Hugelger, a certified master chef, is an old hand at ice carving. His designs have been the centerpiece for food displays in national and international competition; competition which has put more silverware in his trophy case than he has in his utensil drawer.

True to the mission of the American Culinary Federation, though, he places a high value on passing along the benefit of his knowledge and experience to students. He jokes with the gathered scholars as he demonstrates some scroll cuts with a v-shaped chisel.

Tools in this trade don't come cheaply, he points out. The best are imported from Japan.

Chris Sokolowski, under Hugelger's ice-carving tutelage for the second year, has started his own ice-carving business on the side. Opening up a camouflage-painted former hunting bow case, he reveals about a dozen chisels, picks and other cutting tools, each with a sheath to protect carefully honed cutting edges.

"I've only got about \$1,000 worth of equipment," he says, suggesting that this is a small figure among artisans of his kind. "This is just part of it, the ones I use most often."

Taking the cover off one flat-bladed tool, he says, "That one there cost \$55 alone."

The tools look fairly benign, much like stainless steel barbecue tools. Appearances are deceiving, however. The handles are heavy wood, and the blades are razor sharp. Just brushing bare skin against one could draw blood.

"You could do skin grafts with these things," Hugelger says.

"The colder the ice is and the sharper your blade, the better it is for carving," said Hugelger. "When it gets warmer or you use a dull blade, you get what we call scaling. It turns white and chips, and it's just no good for carving."

Some tools are improvised. In the process of handling and carving the ice blocks, their surface can become pitted and opaque. To smoothe the surface and restore the crystal-clear character of the ice, students used an ordinary household steam iron — a sort of impromptu mini-Zamboni.

Ice, believe it or not, does not come cheaply either, though you get a lot for your money. Twelve blocks of ice were carved at Rocky's. Each cost \$45 and all together they weighed in at around five tons.

Stir-frying keeps lamb tender

Stir-fry remains as one of the most popular cooking techniques currently being used. This method was considered just a trendy fad when introduced to this country several years ago. But as more and more information about foods and health were discovered, it also became a healthy style of cooking and eating.

The traditional meats used for this type of cooking have been lean and tender. What better choice for your stir-fry than fresh American lamb. Lamb, by its very nature, is tender so almost any lamb cut can be used. This type of cooking takes very little actual cooking time so once you prepare your lamb and vegetables, it only takes a few minutes before it is time to call the crew for dinner.

It is best to stir-fry lamb at a medium high heat as it cooks so quickly and has little internal marbling. This keeps it tender and juicy. Remember when preparing the lamb and vegetables to keep the pieces uniform in shape so they cook evenly. Choices of cuts for your stir-fry could be a shoulder chop, sirloin steak or center leg steak.

The easiest way to cut the lamb for your stir-fry is to place the cut in the freezer for a short while. Trim all fat before cooking.

The Mandarin Lamb with Oriental Noodles is a sweet and sour sauce which combines the sweetness of mandarin oranges with the crunch and flavor of carrots, squash, red pepper and celery.

The recipe even includes the noodles and eliminates the extra cooking time needed for steamed rice or noodles. Egg rolls from your freezer case, a mixed green salad and steaming pot of tea are the perfect accompaniment to this sweet, but tangy lamb recipe from the American Lamb Council.

MANDARIN LAMB WITH ORIENTAL NOODLES

- 1 tablespoon cooking oil
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 pound boneless American lamb, leg or shoulder
- 1 (3 ounce) package Oriental noodles with flavor packet
- 1 cup water

- 1 small zucchini or yellow squash, cut in half and bias-sliced
- 1 carrot, thinly bias-sliced
- 1/2 medium red pepper, cut in 1/4 inch strips
- 2 stalks celery, thinly bias-sliced
- 1/4 cup ready to use sweet and sour sauce
- 1/4 cup mandarin orange slices, drained
- 1/4 cup coarsely chopped almonds or peanuts (optional)

Slice lamb in 1/4 -inch strips and set aside. Heat oil and garlic to medium high heat in large skillet or wok. Add lamb and stir fry until lamb is no longer pink. Remove from skillet and set aside.

Break up dry noodles and place noodles, 1 cup water, flavor packet and vegetables in skillet. Bring to a boil, reduce heat and cover. Simmer 3 to 5 minutes until vegetables are crisp tender. Stir in lamb strips, sweet and sour sauce and oranges. Heat through. Top with nuts if desired.

put in a terra cotta pot for a "Mexican Fiesta."

Dried soup mix in a soup mug or new pretty soup kettle and ladle for the cold winter ahead.

A variety of flavored popcorns (chocolate coated popcorn, caramel corn or chili seasoned) inside a big popcorn pail.

You can cut the fat without having to focus on the "nos" all the time. If it's a favorite, once a year, special food, that is laden with fat and calories, eat less of it and eat it less often.

Have a safe holiday meal

"Busy holiday times with all the extra food preparation tasks may put you at risk of a food poisoning incident," cautions Sylvia Treitman, home economist for the Oakland County Cooperative Extension Service, Food and Nutrition Hotline. "We get many questions this time of year on ways to save time on entertaining and food preparation. It's great to save time," said Treitman, "however, some time savers become risky food safety practices."

The basics of food safety cannot be ignored. Always follow these basic rules.

- Keep hot foods hot and cold foods cold.
- Do not leave food out more than two hours at room temperature.
- Keep everything in the kitchen clean.

- Do not partially cook foods — or interrupt cooking time.
- Do not pre-stuff a turkey the night before.

Here are some time saving tips: Preplan and make foods ahead of time and freeze or refrigerate them appropriately.

Pre-cut or chop vegetables and refrigerate in plastic bags or ice water. Microwave a smaller turkey — watch temperature until it reaches 180 degrees F. for safety.

Use oven cooking bags for turkey or large roasts to save about 30-60 minutes.

Cut your cooking time in half by cooking two, 10 pound birds instead of one large one. This cuts time from 6 1/2 hours to 3 1/2 hours.

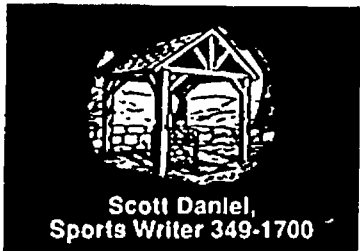

"We can beat this team," Melvin said.

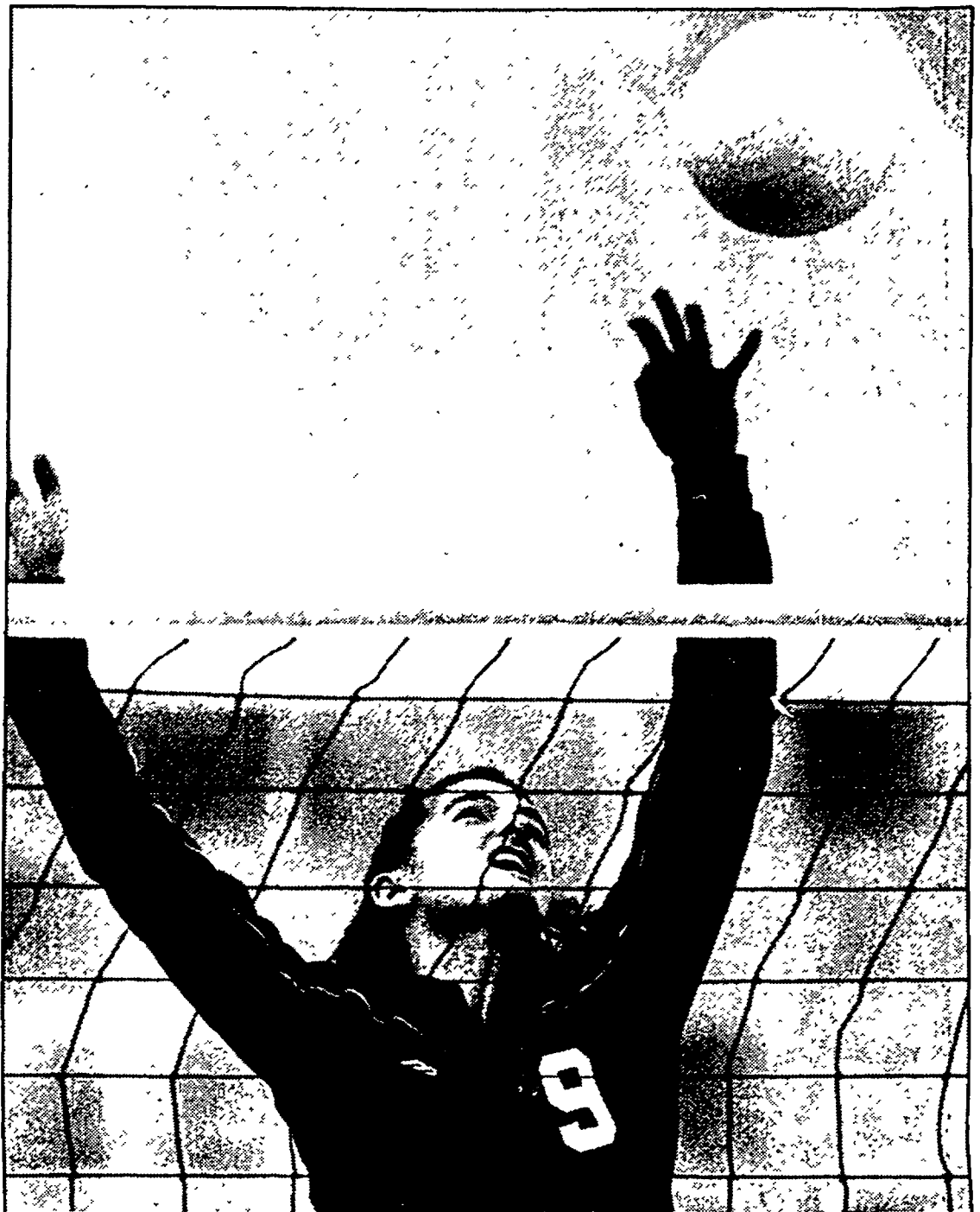

'Dr. Quinn' a prescription for romance, adventure

Boston meets frontier in family drama

By Dan Rice

In her new period piece TV series, Jane Seymour strays from the customary glamour of her miniseries, but, thank the producers, her romantic image remains intact. The author of *Jane Seymour's Guide to Romantic Living* manages to pull some heart strings in a frontier setting in *Dr. Quinn, Medicine Woman*, which has a preview on Friday, Jan. 1, then enters its regular time slot on Saturday, Jan. 2.

Shot in soft, warm hues, *Dr. Quinn* is visually inviting. In the years following the Civil War, Dr. Michaela Quinn (Seymour) is a Boston physician who shares a practice with her father, also a doctor. His death brings an end to her practice in the city, for without his credibility, Michaela is not accepted in her profession by reason of gender. Believing she will only find work in another world, Michaela responds to an ad for a town doctor in Colorado Springs, Colo.

Upon her arrival in the Rocky

Mountain mining town, Michaela learns the prejudice against female doctors exists there as well. The Rev. Johnson (Geoffrey Lower), who placed the ad, wants to send her back to Boston when he discovers she's not a man, but Michaela holds firm with the help of two allies: Charlotte (Diane Ladd), the town mid-wife, and Sully (Joe Lando), a tomahawk-toting, enigmatic young man who is a liason to the local Cheyenne tribe.

Michaela finds that getting her first patients is as hard as pulling teeth, but she perseveres, only to have new troubles in her life: Before dying of a snakebite, Charlotte requests that Michaela take care of her three children, played by Chad Allen, Erika Flores and Shawn Toovey. Then Michaela becomes involved with the Cheyenne, who are being forced into conflict by the Army, and Sully, her knight in moccasins, becomes a closer friend.

Seymour, herself the daughter of

a doctor, was immediately drawn to the character.

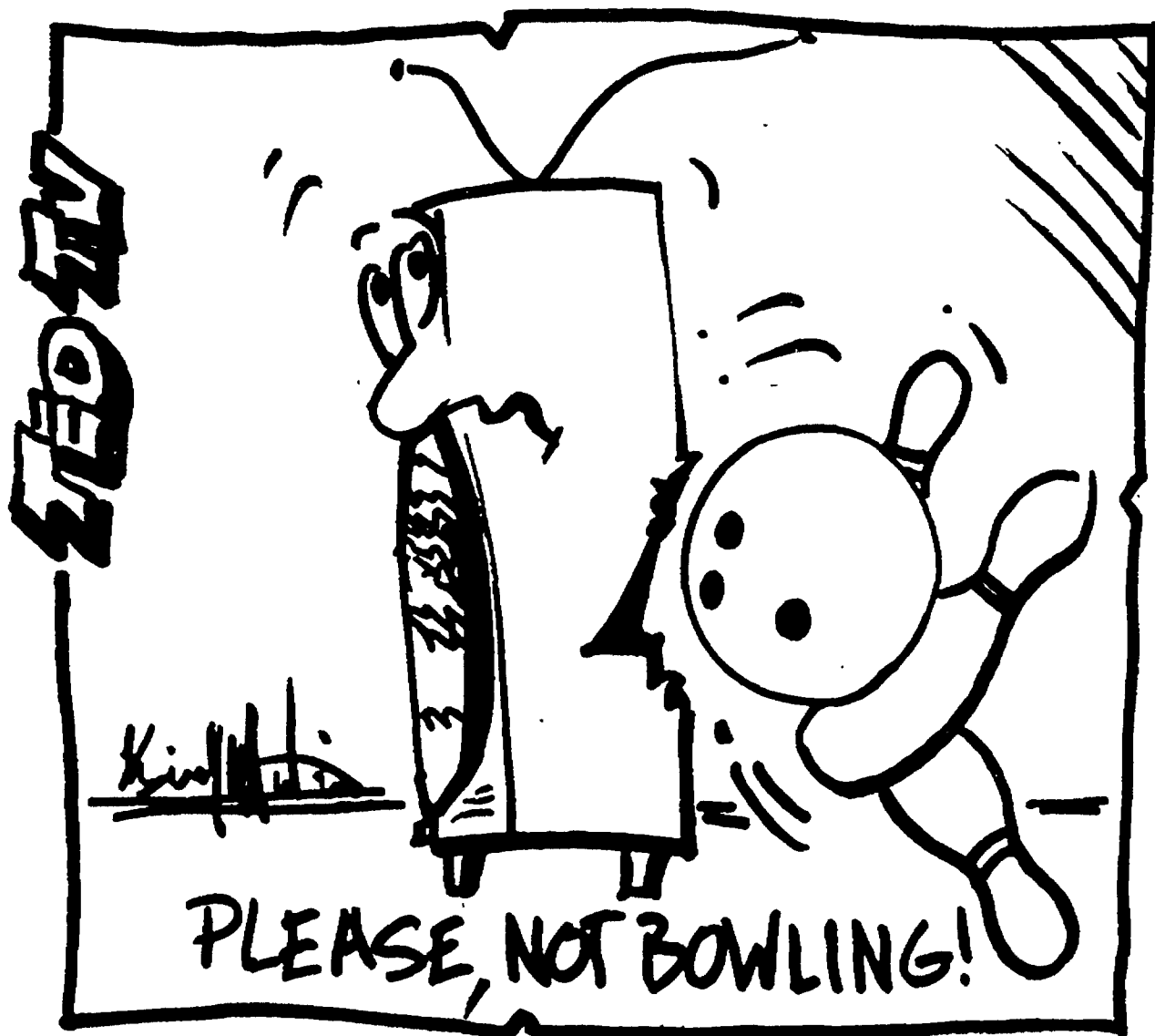
"I like the idea of a woman who is more than just a survivor," Seymour says. "She's a woman who's strong, courageous, and who deals with adversity with the best of feminine instincts."

Executive producer Beth Sullivan is equally thrilled with the casting. "(Seymour) seemed to be the perfect blending of someone who could portray Boston — carry it with her inside — and yet still have the guts to jump on a horse and let her hair fly."

To avoid the harsher weather of Colorado, the series was lensed at California's Paramount Ranch. As for historical accuracy, *Dr. Quinn* rates better than average. The medical wonders Michaela brings to the frontier consist of only a few powders, ointments and a crude stethoscope, and there is plenty of bite-the-stick anesthesia and kitchen-table surgery for Western-movie fans to appreciate.

Seymour takes her new character and all the trappings in stride.

"I'm an actress. I Play it all. That's what I love to do."

The Marquis Theatre-

An Historic Note

The Marquis Theatre, A Northville historic landmark, is a beautifully restored structure with almost eighty years of rich history and tradition. Elegantly constructed along a Victorian theme, it was built as an opera house and later presented live vaudeville. Charlie Chaplin and Mary Pickford were among the stars who appeared at the theatre. Movies followed live shows, but during those years the theatre was allowed to deteriorate.

The Zayti Family purchased the Marquis in 1971 and began resoration in 1978. Working along with the crew, they discovered many hidden treasures. The theatre's original glass French doors were found intact under plywood panels. Craftsmen removed eight coats of

paint to reveal the original splendor of the black walnut ticket booth. The handsome old brass door handles were found backstage and were painstakingly restored to their original condition. They were reunited with the doors, which now stand proudly at the lobby entrance.

The interior of the theatre has been extensively refurbished. The space in the lobby, where the beautifully designed stained glass windows are now located, was once an open space. It allowed patrons, for a mere 5¢, to listen to, and enjoy, the live entertainment of the day. The lushly upholstered seats, with the wrought-iron framework, were chosen to re-create the original Victorian theme.

The year's productions continue a tradition of quality and

professional entertainment. The Marquis has presented hit shows (Oklahoma, Carousel, Gypsy, A Little Night Music, Annie, Nunsense, and Driving Miss Daisy); top performers (Count Basie, Woody Herman, The Ink Spots, The Pied Pipers, The Four Lads, The Harmonicats, and the Four Freshmen); and Classical musicians (Flavio Varani, The American Trio, Ervin Monroe). The Marquis Light Opera has become a resident professional company and will regularly present fully staged light-opera and operettas. In recent years the Marquis has been specializing in children's theatre, capturing the imagination of our young audiences with feature shows such as Peter Pan, The Wizard of Oz, Charlotte's Web, Rumpelstiltskin, and many more.

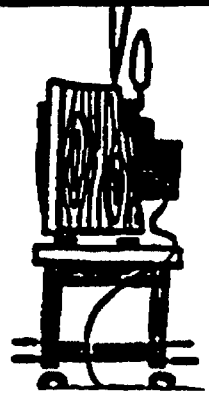

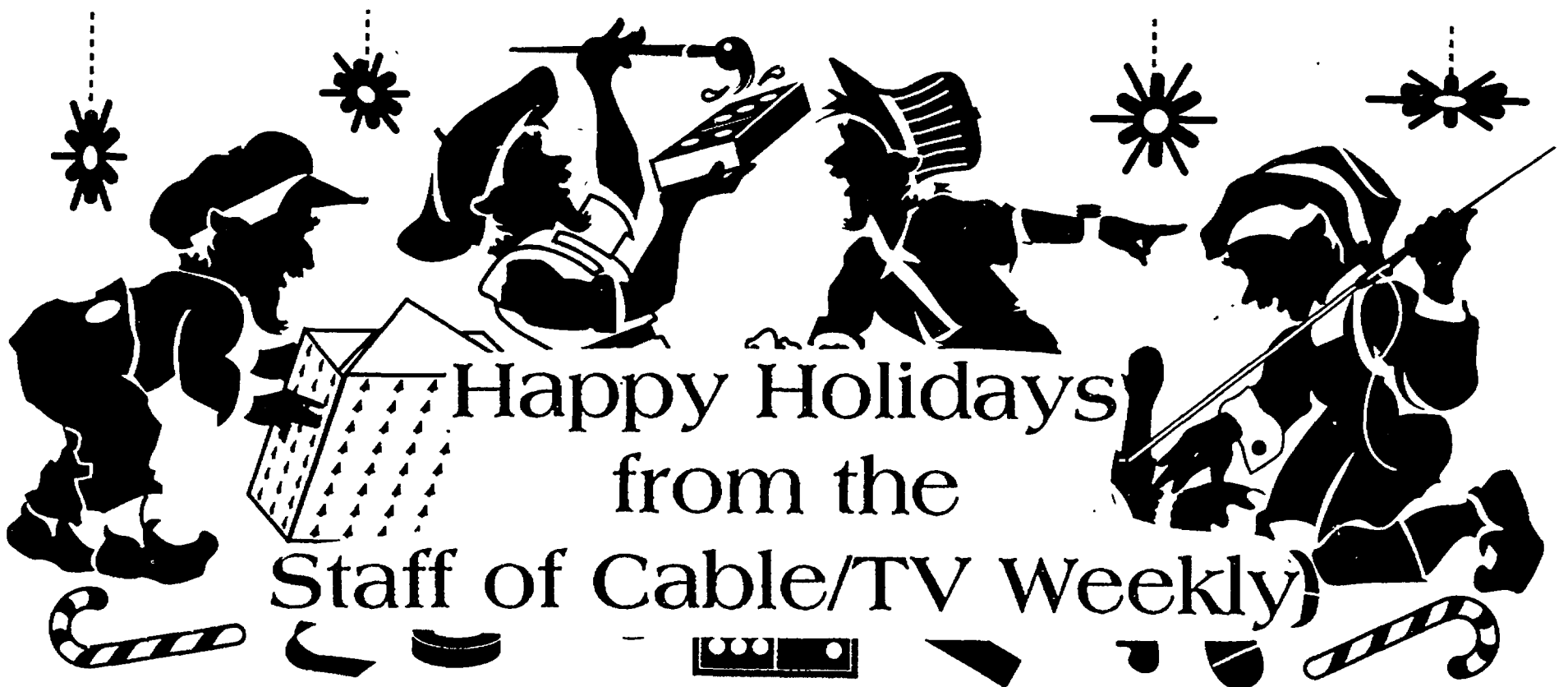

STAR NOTES

Heston twixt heaven and Hell's Kitchen

Charlton Heston knows the value of good material. The star of the biblical epics *The Ten Commandments*, *Ben-Hur* and *The Greatest Story Ever Told* now lends his powerful voice to the four-part performance documentary *Charlton Heston Presents the Bible*,

starting Sunday, Dec. 20, on A&E.

The actor worked his way up from a humble beginning. Born Charles Carter, the Michigan native studied on an acting scholarship at Northwestern University before enlisting for a stint in the Air Corps. Back in civilian life, Heston and his wife, Lydia, moved to New York's Hell's Kitchen, where he worked sporadically as an artists' model before getting his first break in community theater.

After his 1948 Broadway debut in *Antony and Cleopatra*, Heston found work in the new medium of live tele-

vision, in programs such as *Studio One*. He crossed the bridge to Hollywood in 1950 with the film noir *Dark City*. Since then he has made his mark as the lead in many historical dramas, but his roles in fictional films are equally memorable: *Ruby Gentry*, *Treasure Island*, *Planet of the Apes*, *Will Penny* and *Soylent Green* are but a few.

Politically outspoken, Heston has served six terms as president of the Screen Actor's Guild and chairman of the American Film Institute, but is not interested in public office.

E! big enough for women, Stern; romantics to get their own channel

E! Entertainment Television is working with the Los Angeles chapter of the National Organization for Women (NOW) to develop programming addressing a variety of women's issues as they pertain to entertainment. The relationship began when NOW threatened a boycott effort in response to E!'s hiring of abrasive talk-show host Howard Stern.

An American export to Russian television is *CBS Week*, a hodgepodge of news, entertainment, reality and children's programming anchored by Dan Rather. After *CBS Week's* seven-day run beginning Monday, Dec. 21, Russian State Television will air CBS' *60 Minutes* on a monthly basis and the reality-based *Rescue: 911* every week. By the middle of 1993, these broadcasts will come to combine Russian and American segments and have a Russian host.

American Movie Classics plans to launch a second channel, Romance Classics, in early 1994. The 24-hour premium channel, targeted at women, begins with a library of over 1,000 romance-movie titles and plans to develop original series and full-length specials based on romance novels. Romance Classics will also cover society and celebrity weddings.

Showtime recently announced its lineup of original films for 1993 and there are some interesting projects scheduled. *Chantilly Lace* is an unscripted, improvisational film starring JoBeth Williams, Talia Shire, Martha Plimpton, Lindsay Crouse, Jill Eikenberry, Helen Slater and Ally Sheedy. Charles Durning and Carol Kane reunite for a sequel to the 1979 chiller *When a Stranger Calls*, and a followup to Alfred Hitchcock's *The Birds* is being developed.

The "Showtime 30-Minute Movie" series will turn the director's chair over to Laura Dern, Sally Field, Andy Garcia, Danny Glover, Don Johnson, Peter Weller and Treat Williams.

Conan softens image for cartoon series

Since 1933, books about Conan, a warrior from an age of wizards and kings, have held the imagination of armchair adventurers. More recently, Conan has become a Marvel Comics superhero and the protagonist of two films starring Arnold Schwarzenegger.

This season, a younger, gentler Conan has turned up in *Conan, the Adventurer*, a syndicated weekly cartoon saga. *Conan* is a robust action series strong on fantasy and imagination and light on hacking and gouging.

Though he's more humane, Conan still champions the cause of justice, but quick thinking and some cleverly drawn escape routes allow him to do so minus the bloody swordplay. Where the gore is no more, catty humor and magical meanies abound.

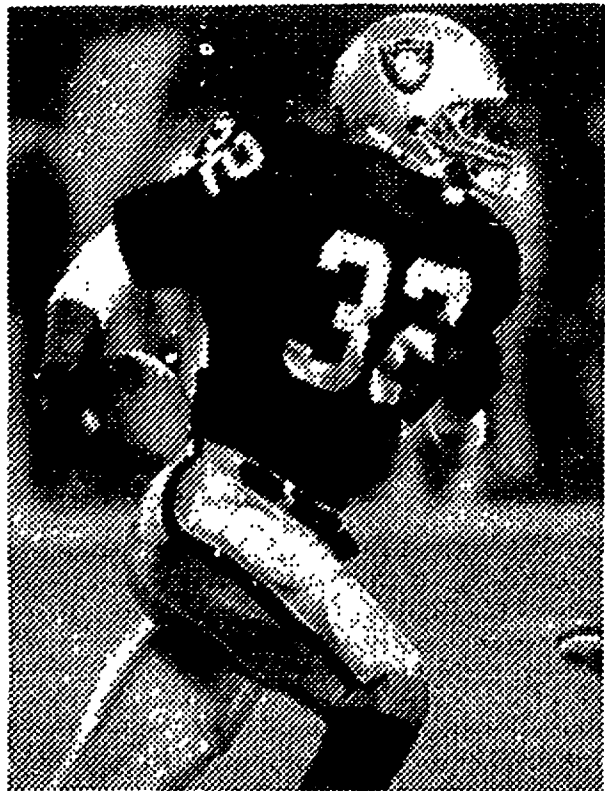
The 18-year-old hero brandishes a sword forged by his father from a metal discovered in the wake of a meteor shower. His friends include the telepathic Needle, archer Falkenar, circus girl Jezmine and the good wizard Greywolf. There's also Conan's black stallion, Thunder, who can outrun any horse. Together, they seek the villain Wrath-Amon, who has turned all the inhabitants of Conan's village to stone. The episodes unfold in comic-book fashion, with flashbacks smack in the middle of a story line.

Conan may speak softly and carry a big sword, but, remembering he could put an eye out, he never uses it.

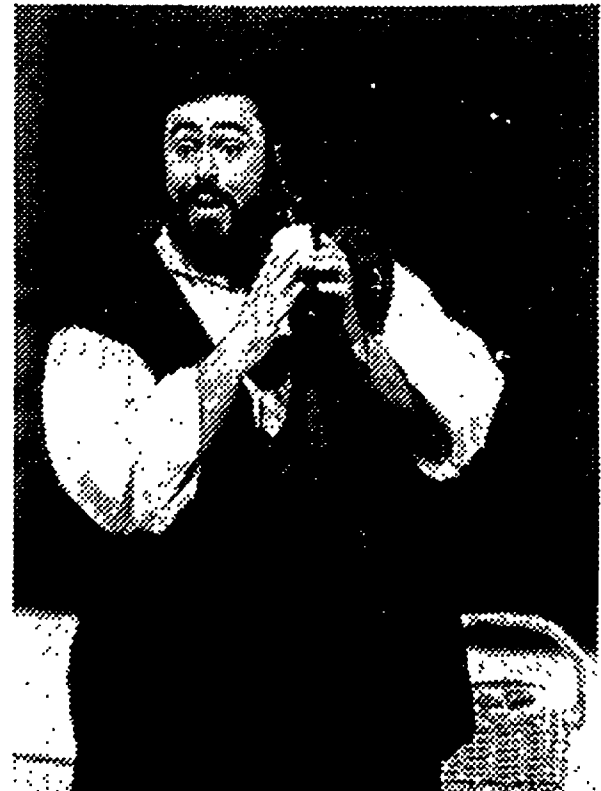

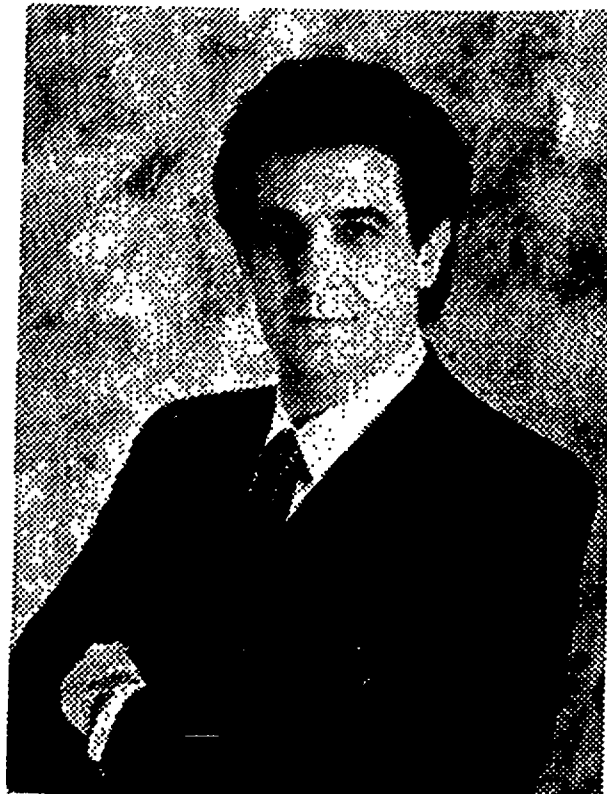
