Council passes building use fees

Add meeting space to the list of things that are getting tougher to find for free.

The Northville City Council recently approved fees for the use of municipal buildings including City Hall and the Scout Building. The move follows last year's implementation of a fee schedule by Northville Public Schools.

Under the city's new fee schedule, which takes effect Feb. 1, non-profit groups would be charged \$4 per hour up to \$20 for each use and for-profit groups would be assessed an \$8-per-hour fee. The city manager's office would handle reservations for facility use, and could require a security deposit. The city manager would have the right to negotiate reduced fees or exempt groups from the fees.

City government functions would receive first priority when using the facilities, and city-sponsored meetings and events would not be charged.

"I don't believe the fee schedule is out of line in any way, shape or form," said City Manager Gary Word. But he noted that the policy will allow him to exempt "unique or special groups," adding, "I would prefer not to identify those groups in advance."

The council first debated whether to set fees in September, and postponed a decision until Word could review the proposal further. The discussion began when Word proposed a flat \$5-per-hour fee for use of the Scout Building. The building, at 215 W. Cady, houses the Senior Citizens Center run by Northville Parks and Recreation.

Parks Director Traci Gottschalk noted that the Senior Center's budget had been picking up the heating and electrical tab run up by other users, as well as the cost of janitorial services. A fee system would help defray those costs, she said.

Council Member Jerry Mittman had suggested including City Hall in any fee schedule, a suggestion which helped send the proposal back for further review.

While the council agreed to the expanded fee schedule Jan. 4, members spoke up on behalf of several non-profit groups. Mayor Chris Johnson noted that the emergency needs service Civic Concern, which distributes food to the needy from the Scout Building, would be hurt by any fee.

"I'd like to see an exception for them, because fees would put them out of business," he said.

Council Member Mark Cryderman questioned charging local scouts for using the facility named after them, since the scouts raised the funds and donated the labor to construct it in 1963.

Word noted the members' concerns, but asked them to let him decide who should qualify for exemptions.

"Give the city manager, at least for a while, the discretion to make the decision as to who should or should not be charged these fees (and to weigh each individual group on its own merits)," he said.

Down on the farm Maybury popular with students

When students from Old Village School first started visiting Maybury Farm in Northville Township over a year ago, they were a little hesitant.

That's certainly not the case now. "Initially, some of the students were intimidated because they didn't have that experience," Katherine McEvoy, who teaches dually-diagnosed special education students at Old Village, said. "That's gone by the way-side. They think they own the place now."

For the last year and a half, students have gone to the farm once a week to gather eggs, sweep the barn and feed the chickens, ducks and cats.

"The whole idea started with the Partnership with Education program," McEvoy said.

The district contacted Maybury Farm with the idea, and farmer John Beemer visited the classroom to explain the concept of farming. From there, the children then went to the farm and were assigned a list of small chores. And the next week they went back again, and again.

"It has made them very independent," McEvoy said. "They go right in and get their equipment."

Besides independence, the visits also teach students about life. For example, Farmer Beemer sent some eggs back with students who watched them hatch in the classroom last fall. Now, they feed those same baby chicks at the farm.

"We have follow-up activities," McEvoy said. "We talk about the farm chores we did. Obviously, we also get to see what the changes from season to season bring, too, like the pigs birthing."

"There's continuity going back and forth — they also give farm reports after each visit."

During harvest time, Farmer Beemer demonstrated collecting honey from bees and also gave the students a hay ride.

"John Beemer is the perfect person for this," McEvoy said. "He is extremely patient with (students) and can communicate with them."

At the beginning of each week, students decide who will do what chores for the next visit. The students, ages 6 through 14, comprise three classes at Old Village.

"It's a real safe environment for them," McEvoy said. "The little cats and chickens running around — they (students) attach themselves to them."

Veteran officer accepts police retirement plan

Northville City's loss will soon be the Village of Brooklyn's gain, as Lieutenant Gerald Ryan leaves the city police force to head the consolidated Brooklyn-Columbia Police Department.

Ryan is the first command officer to leave under a recently-approved early retirement proposal designed to trim the police budget and give remaining officers more seniority.

The 42-year-old Canton resident, who has served as a Northville City police officer for more than two decades, said he will officially retire Jan. 24. "The day I retire is the day I hit 21 years," he said.

Ryan has seen a lot of changes in Northville's department over those years, changes he hopes to help implement in Brooklyn.

"Northville's gotten a lot more professional than it used to be," he said. "I'd say we're near the top in area departments in training and formal education."

"Where I'm going in Brooklyn, it's more informal. It reminds me of Northville when I started . . . I think there's a lot of room to grow out there."

Brooklyn and the township of Columbia, which are southeast of Jackson, have shared a police department for the past five years, Ryan said. The 40-square-mile area's year-round population of 8,000 swells to 30,000 in the summertime as tourists and vacationers flock to its golf courses

and three large lakes — Columbia, Clark and Vineyard.

"It also has Michigan International Speedway, which brings in 100,000 people on the weekends," Ryan said.

Ryan, who earned about \$50,000 a year as a Northville police officer, will actually be taking a pay cut to go to Brooklyn. He said the retirement package made the move possible.

The roughly \$35,000-a-year chief's position is "on the low end of the scale," he noted, but he said he was attracted by the challenge of heading a young police department in a growing but still relatively rural area.

"In fact, I was offered the chief of police's position at a bigger depart-

Parking banned on Silver Springs

Be careful what you wish for, you may get it.

In 1988, Northville Township Fire Chief Robert Toms petitioned the Wayne County Road Commission to prohibit residents from parking on the east side of Silver Springs Drive.

Four years later, Wayne County has finally acted on the former fire chief's request. Not only did the county road commission agree with Toms' assessment of the potential hazards of parking on the east side of the street, but now the county isn't letting anybody park on either side of the road.

The county's ruling came down last week, and even Township Police Chief Chip Snider's verbal appeal of the ruling didn't hold much weight.

"We requested that parking remain status quo with parking on the east side of the street," Chief Snider said. "But our verbal appeal was denied, and now the county will be posting 'no parking signs' on both sides of the street."

The county's ruling triggers a serious concern for Highland Lakes residents and for Northville school officials who fear the absence of street parking will crowd the parking lot at Silver Springs Elementary.

Highland Lakes resident Russell Fogg, who is also a newly elected

township trustee, said he believes the county acted illogically in changing the signage. He also thinks the county's move could spur additional safety hazards in that area.

"This is a situation that's been fine for 23 years," Fogg said. "Now they are creating a greater inconvenience and a much greater accident situation and all for the sake of some bureaucrat who isn't willing to change his mind."

"It just doesn't make any sense," he continued. "It's really just a shame because there are so many things that really need attention and with this situation if they touch it they'll just mess it all up."

David Bolitho, assistant superintendent for administrative services at Northville Public Schools, said the county's ruling poses concerns for district administrators and Silver Springs staff. He said the matter was brought to his attention by Township Trustee Russell Fogg.

"The county's order has been to put in the appropriate signage and that will have a negative impact on Highland Lakes residents and on the school district," Bolitho said Friday.

Bolitho fears the absence of street parking will tempt residents and guests of Highland Lakes' homeowners to park in the school lot. That concerns Bolitho who worries about

Elvis sighted at local post office

At the Northville Post Office, they started lining up at 11:30 a.m. last Friday.

By the magic hour of 12:01 p.m. more than 33 people were standing in line.

The big attraction? Elvis stamps!

Postal authorities had predicted a big rush on the 29-cent stamps bearing the visage of the "young Elvis." And the prediction proved to be 100 percent accurate, even in the relatively small confines of the Northville post office at the corner of Wing and Cady streets.

Northville Postmaster Judy Buffmyer said she was not at all surprised at the turnout. In fact, she said she had expected it.

"When we put out the cards for people to vote on the 'old Elvis' or the 'young Elvis,' they were gone by noon," she said. "I had to scrounge around to find more cards for people to vote on," she said.

Buffmyer refused to characterize Northville as a hotbed of Elvis fans, however. "I think he's popular everywhere," she said.

The first person in line last Friday was Robie Roberts, a Canton woman who said she had arrived about 11:15 a.m. to get her Elvis stamps. "I've been an Elvis fan all my life, and I wouldn't miss the stamp for anything," she said.

Roberts said she planned to buy three sheets of the stamps.

And what was she going to do with them? "Frame them," she said. "They definitely won't be put on envelopes."

Irma Balardi of Bloomfield Hills was also close to the front of the line. She said she was there to get the stamps for her daughter, Maryann, owner of Balardi's Hair Salon in Main Centre, and several of the operators at the salon.

After cooing, she admitted that she was going to get some stamps for herself as well. "I'm a stamp

collector," she explained.

Two of the more animated people in line were Judy Kohl of Northville and her friend, Kathy Fordyce of Plymouth.

They had visited Graceland (Elvis' home in Memphis, Tenn.) together and were not about to miss out on the opportunity to buy Elvis stamps the first time they became available, they said.

"We're not 'screaming Elvis fans,'" said Kohl. "But we're fans. After visiting Graceland, getting the stamps seemed like the logical progression."

"It was the logical thing to do," added Fordyce.

Few stamp-collectors seemed more ardent than Patty Bloch of Northville, who said she left her husband home with her little one in order to get the stamps at the stroke of 12 o'clock.

"He was the greatest," she said earnestly of the hip-swinging crooner. "I don't care what anyone says. He could have been overweight; he could have lost all his hair. But he was still the greatest."

Church applies its dance proceeds to education

Administrators at Our Lady of Providence are looking to use the proceeds from this year's 36th annual Susie's Dance to boost the center's vocational training program.

Susie's Dance, the annual dinner dance has been the center's main fundraising activity since it opened in 1957.

Our Lady of Providence is a private, non-profit organization that is located in Northville Township and provides residential, educational and

vocational opportunities for mentally impaired children and young adults. It is owned and operated by the Daughters of St. Mary of Providence.

Now in its 36th year, this year's dinner dance will be held on Saturday, April 24, at Laurel Manor in Livonia. The evening features dinner and dancing, a silent auction and raffles, and a brief glimpse at the center through a brief student band performance.

Center administrator Sister Linda Willette said she has set a new goal of \$80,000 for this year's fundraiser. Last year the center reached its goal

of \$60,000. That money was used to enhance the therapeutic swimming, physical fitness and recreation program.

Proceeds from this fundraiser will enhance the center's Vocational Training and Support Employment Program for the young adults who live at the center on Beck Road near Five Mile Road. Sr. Willette said she intends to use the money raised at Susie's Dance to expand the center's vocational program and provide more work training and job opportunities for young persons with developmental disabilities.

"Our vocational program is intended for the young adults who are at least 26 years old and have completed the schooling portion of our program," she said. "We are looking to expand our services to other young adults in the community. We want to add more workshops, job networking, and supported employment."

This year Sr. Willette said she's targeting advertising for the annual event to local businesses with the hopes they attend the fundraiser and join the job opportunity network.

In an effort to spur more business involvement and get more business

people active in the vocational program, she said she's initiated a new corporate advertising campaign for the fundraiser this year. In press packets Our Lady of Providence released to area businesses right before the holidays, Sr. Willette invited local businesses to sponsor corporate tables at this year's dinner dance.

For \$500 corporations can sponsor a table of 10 and have their name displayed at the table in addition to being mentioned in the center's Ad Book and Quarterly Newsletter which is mailed to homes in Plymouth, Northville, Livonia and the surrounding communities.

"What we are trying to do is generate more community awareness of our program, get more exposure and possibly get more job opportunities for our young adults," she said.

When they located the house within the Northville city limits, all it took was one phone call to the Marinos' Coldwell Banker Realtor. The Marinos currently have their home up for sale.

"We thought 'why not?' " Sarah Marino said when the Realtor told them of the production company's request.

On Friday, the Marinos home had been rearranged by crew members. Furniture was temporarily placed in hallways, and plywood boards and rubber mats covered the floors. A cameraman

and prop man looked for the perfect angle while Weideman watched over the entire process.

"They told us right away what it would be like," Sarah Marino said as crew members carried away another piece of furniture. "There's a lot more to it than anybody realizes. It's very interesting to just learn and watch."

The commercial advertises a family doctor referral service which features a young girl singing in the background "the foot bone's connected to the head bone . . ." A narrator then speaks while the little girl continues her song.

The production company is filming the commercial for Berkel and Company Advertising of Grand Rapids.

Kettle Drive reaches goal

The hundreds of volunteers who rang bells for the Salvation Army's annual holiday kettle drive can rest their arms now.

The fundraiser, coordinated by the Plymouth Salvation Army, met its \$100,000 goal by the Christmas Eve deadline. The Plymouth post also serves residents of Northville and Canton.

A total of \$104,498 was raised by volunteers at retail locations throughout Northville, Plymouth, Canton and the Westland Mall.

More than 100 Northville volunteers stood by kettles at the Northville Post Office, Shopping Center Market, Meijer and A & P. They raised nearly \$21,906 themselves, which was added to the pot along with \$35,365 from Plymouth, \$33,225 from Canton and \$14,002 from the Westland

Mall.

A long list of Northville organizations contributed volunteers to this year's fundraiser, including the City of Northville, Northville City Fire Department, Northville Community Chamber of Commerce, Northville Co-op Preschool, Northville Historical Society, and VFW Post 4012.

Area churches including the First Presbyterian, Methodist and Our Lady of Victory are staffing collection sites, as are local Athletic Boosters, Friends of the Library, Jaycees, Kiwanis, Kiwanis Early Birds, League of Women Voters, Mother's Club, Newcomers Club and Single Place members.

The Northville volunteers worked under the direction of organizers William E. Davis, Tad Evans and Bill Slinger.

Most of the money from Salvation Army kettles goes to provide food, clothing and Christmas gifts to needy area families. Last year, said Corps Commander Lt. Jeffrey Beachum, the Salvation Army helped 828 people from 230 local families at Christmas alone. The Army Corps also meets emergency needs for prescriptions, utility bills and rental payments.

Of the total money raised, 92 percent goes directly to help the needs. The remaining 8 percent covers administrative costs.

The family would appreciate memorials to the Salvation Army or a charity of choice.

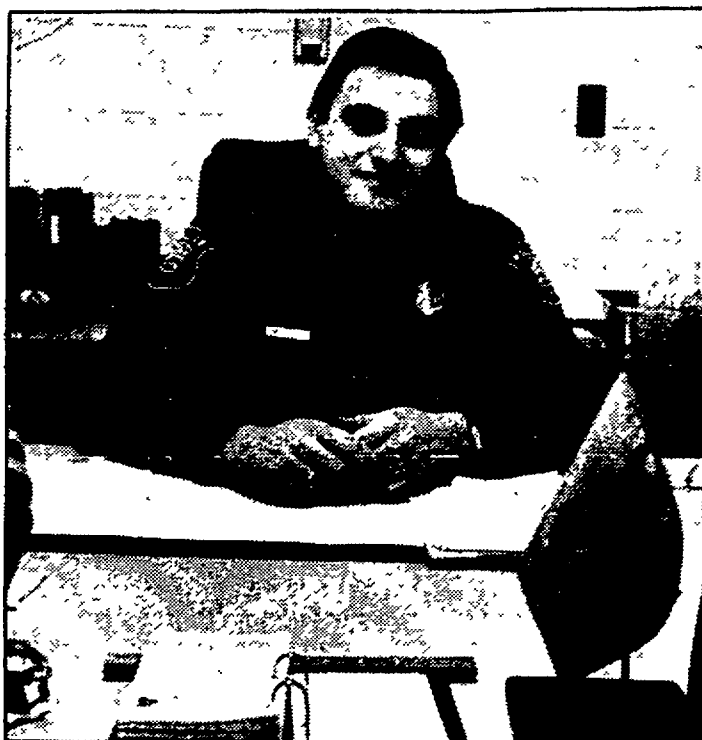

ment, with \$11,000 more a year, but I turned it down," he said.

Ryan said last week that he has already logged many hours at the Brooklyn-Columbia department, working seven days a week between the two positions since Dec. 11. "In fact, tonight I've got to go to a board meeting out there. . . I'm going to approach them about hiring five more people part-time."

"I look at this as phase two of my career," he said. "This is another challenge. You've got to keep testing yourself."

Ryan is no stranger to challenges, having come to Northville in 1972 with an associate's degree in police science. He'll be leaving with a Bachelor of Science degree in criminal justice and a Master's degree in public administration, degrees he earned while working full-time for the city.

More than that, though, the 21-year stint has taught him about maturity.

"Northville's treated me well," he said. "I can't complain professionally,

personally or financially. I've met some good people in Northville that have really taught me a lot, and it's more than just police work. It's life values too. . . I feel like I've grown up in this town."

Ryan's move is the first of four anticipated departures under the city's recently-approved early retirement program for command officers with more than 20 years on the force.

Typically, officers must work 25

years and reach the age of 50 to receive the full retirement package.

The three other officers who qualify under the new program—Sgt. David Delauder, Sgt. Allen Cox and Sgt. Donald Lancaster—could leave the force between Jan. 1 and June 30. Their departures would be staggered to allow a smooth transition.

The resulting vacancies will save the city money by replacing the command officers with patrol officers at a lower salary. It also provides more seniority to officers now on the force, and allow them to keep their jobs when police are laid off at the end of Northville Downs' racing season in April.

Parking ban sparks school concerns

busing and additional traffic in school lots.

"The school district needs the parking for the school's large events, meetings and for snow removal," Bolitho said. "When we have large, all-school activities, parking is already a problem and if we have people parking there who aren't parents it will make parking less available and even more restrictive."

"Plus those people may be there when school is opening and that could compound our parking situation. The other issue is our elections.

Silver Springs is a precinct, and we have seen a significant increase in the number of people involved in elections and we do need the parking places for that."

With school officials and Highland Lakes residents all at odds with the county on the issue, Fire Chief Rick Rosselle feels partly responsible. He said he co-authored Toms' request to the county in 1988 because he was equally concerned about the street parking obstructing fire services in that area.

He said the original request stemmed from when the township

moved the fire station to Five Mile. That move forced the fire department to enter Highland Lakes from the south end of the subdivision rather than through the customary north entrance on Eight Mile.

Parking on the east side of the street blocked fire fighters' access to fire hydrants, he said.

"All we were asking for was for the county to change the parking to the opposite side of the street," he said. "But now Wayne County has a new ruling that restricts them from allowing parking on either side of the street."

"I got everybody up in arms over it," Chief Rosselle said. "But the traffic survey was done by the state police and by the county and if that's what Wayne County wants then there isn't much we can do."

Bolitho said he talked with Thaddeus McCotter, Northville's representative on the Wayne County Commission, to see what McCotter could do to get the county's decision reversed. McCotter said he would be checking into the matter and would get back to Bolitho as soon as he had word on it.

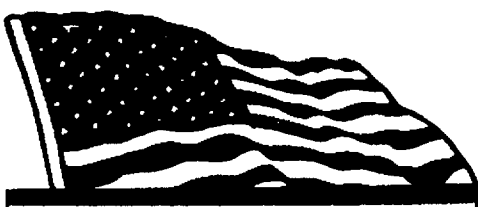

Landfill fiasco points to disturbing trend

Heed the warning signs.

It is not exactly unusual for the leaders of a political reform movement, once in power, to produce something, in their zealotry, as bad or worse than their predecessors.

Things are not going well in Northville Township these days. The tenure of the new township supervisor and the new township board is already off to a rocky start. We see a disturbing pattern developing.

As the new supervisor, Karen Baja should still be enjoying that so-called "honeymoon" period with the press and the public that nearly all those elected get when they first take office. With the news that she proposed a revision to the township's Browning-Ferris Industries contract that would allow construction of a landfill in Northville, we fear that honeymoon period is coming to a very abrupt end.

But as politically sensitive as landfill siting can be, our primary concern here today is something else. It is with her openness . . . or better put, the apparent lack of it.

The supervisor's lack of openness on the landfill issue is not the first example we have seen. Our concern is that it seems to be developing into a pattern. And that too is a shame, considering Baja campaigned on a promise of more openness in township hall.

Our first concern was a lack of responsiveness to press inquiries from the *Northville Record*. We recognize that during part of this time the supervisor was ill, but that does not excuse her evasiveness entirely. We did not previously make a public issue of it, but our role is to inform the public and when a public official does not respond to a reporter's and an editor's phone calls, that official is not responding to the public.

Then came the Richard Henningson debacle. We've said our piece about that on this page already, but we'll briefly restate it here.

As the township manager, Henningson held the most important administrative position in the community. As much as we can appreciate Baja's desire to treat him in a "humane" fashion when the board chose not to renew his contract, the public should have a say in the question of who will be running the township administration.

At the very least, they should be able to hear the discussion so they can understand the reasons behind such an important decision. But they never got the chance. They deserve better . . . and frankly, so did Henningson.

Now comes the landfill issue. The public already knows that Northville Township has been reviewing its agreement with BFI regarding the use of a township sewer line. The current board was unhappy with that contract, and was drawn up by the former board, and was searching for ways to get out of it.

The township attorney, however, has ruled that the board needs to abide by its agreement despite the fact that it was made by a previous board.

It was during discussion of that

contract that Baja proposed opening the door to a landfill, just one of five amendments the township asked BFI to add on. The township board approved the revisions under the understanding that Baja and attorneys would hammer out the final details in closed-door meetings.

Given that, it appeared entirely possible that the contract might be inked and put into place without much discussion.

The only "public" discussion was held at two special board meetings. The first was at a township board work session, held at 2 o'clock on a Monday afternoon — not exactly the kind of place where Northville residents expect substantive policy questions to be debated or decided, and not the kind of meeting the average Northville resident can attend. And the other was at a last-minute Dec. 22 special board meeting over the holiday break.

Now, Baja argues the township did not "request" a landfill, but merely wanted to remove from the wording a provision specifically prohibiting a landfill in Northville. But apparently it was Baja's proposal to eliminate that wording and not BFI's.

The best explanation we've been given to date was that the purpose may have been to gain for the township payments from the dumping fees at any such landfill. But of course to receive such payments, such a landfill would have to be sited here.

However you want to phrase it, the township supervisor initiated a change in that contract to leave the door ajar for a possible landfill, possibly to reap a financial benefit for the township. Our guess is that most Northville residents would think that a poor trade-off.

Regardless, Northville residents should have a chance to hear that idea and give input to it before any contract is finalized. As the township board has already seen from the attorney's review of the BFI contract, you may not be able to get out of an agreement later once it's on paper.

Almost as disturbing is another inconsistency. Back in the election, Baja criticized the former township board for letting the former township supervisor negotiate contracts all by herself. And yet that's exactly what Baja asked for and got here . . . and on an issue as important as the possibility of a landfill being sited in the township.

As we said, we think there is a pattern developing here. We believe Baja does indeed favor openness and more public input as she claimed during the election. But she seems to be developing a habit in which, when an important issue comes up, she finds more reasons to make an exception to that openness.

To the contrary, the more important an issue is, the more important that it be debated in full view of the public.

Northville student adds speech to Voice of Democracy

It took him all of one weekend to write his speech for a local writing competition, but when he was done Jeffrey Schroder was pleased with what he had to say.

"I like to know that what I have to say affects others," Schroder said.

The 17-year-old Northville High School senior recently won the local competition of the Voice of Democracy broadcast scriptwriting program, sponsored by Veteran of Foreign Wars Northville Post 4012 and its auxiliary. He was awarded a certificate of merit and \$100. Schroder will advance to the district competition

stated this month in Redford.

"I'm very grateful for the people of the Veterans of Foreign Wars and them wanting to help young people because getting a good education is important," Schroder said.

Maintaining a 3.3 grade point average throughout his high school career, Schroder isn't sure what he plans to study, though he may pursue a career in business or law. He does, however, plan to start studying his core curriculum at Michigan State University.

"I want to have a lot of options," he said. "The job market is not like it was when my dad was in high school."

Because of the extensive political

experience Schroder has collected in his young years, many have asked why he isn't interested in becoming involved in politics.

"I've seen the dark side of politics," he said. "It has to deal with going up against the establishment. It's a hard thing to do to go up against an enemy, and then there's the fund-raising, mudslinging and stress."

During his freshman year, Schroder worked on Bill Schuette's congressional campaign. He would travel ahead of the candidate and pass out flyers at whistle stops.

"Once he (Schuette) stood outside the Pontiac Silverdome and shook hands with everyone going into the

football game," Schroder said.

During the summer of 1991, Schroder campaigned for Deborah Whyman, a Canton Republican, in a special election primary.

His latest political work was on the Burl Atkins for Congress campaign.

Schroder has also been known to make his voice heard at a Northville Township meeting or two.

But the political campaigning has ended, for now, while Schroder opted to concentrate on his school work during his senior year.

"I could have done better if I would have made school a priority," he said.

He does have one extra-curricular activity, though, as he's a dedicated

member of the school's forensic team.

Forensics involves extemporaneous speaking, where students are given a question about current events and assigned 30 minutes to prepare before giving a five- to eight-minute speech on the topic.

Schroder participated in last year's national forensic competition held in Washington, D.C., with other members of his high school team.

"I'm very proud of the fact that we made it there after coming out of nowhere," Schroder said.

Convict turns crime-fighter in 'Marked for Murder'

Sandman proves he has true grit

In NBC's movie *Marked for Murder*, airing Sunday, Jan. 17, the Philadelphia police force has a new member whose honesty and caring puts the other cops to shame. He's a convict called the "Sandman."

In the thriller, the Justice Department's Dr. Jean Horton (Laura Johnson of *Falcon Crest*) proposes an innovative program using prisoners in the urban fight against crime. Despite widespread disapproval, Capt. Jack Reilly (Billy Dee Williams) takes her up on the plan, and the two go shopping for the right man. They decide on Mace "Sandman" Moutron (Powers Boothe), a tough ex-Marine whose abuse by the foster care and military systems has left him with a hatred for authority. Mace isn't interested in law enforcement, but as Capt. Jack points out, he doesn't have any other offers.

Capt. Jack's precinct is riddled with corruption, and the trail leads to crime lord Bats O'Bannon (Michael Ironside). Mace is assigned to accompany a pair of patrol officers, but their ineptitude and blind eye to the city's troubled Jamaican community lead him to strike out on his own. Mace proves to be a resourceful unarmed crimefighter (he's forbidden to carry a gun).

Boothe brings the Sandman and all his inner torment to vicious life; the spooky eyes of the actor have not been better used since his starring role as the suicidal cult leader in *Guyana Tragedy: The Jim Jones Story*.

"I think the character is very cartoonish in many ways," director Mimi Leder says, "especially in the way we portrayed him fighting crime without the use of a gun. (But he's) definitely a man with a moral center. The system did him wrong, then he overcame it. There was a lot of love in his heart, and it's deeply buried, but he can reach in, and does."

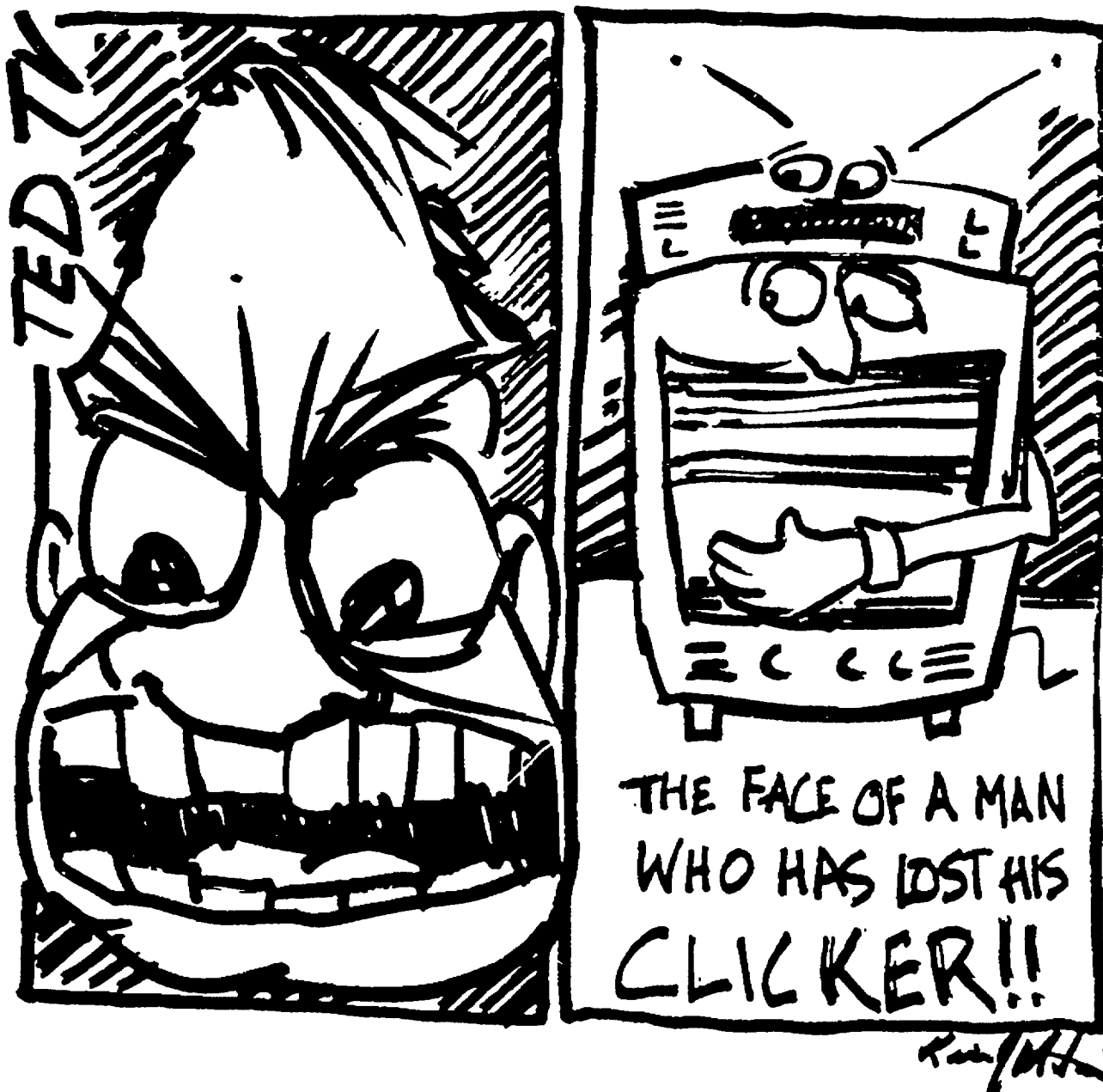
It is somewhat unusual that this action film was directed by a woman. An Emmy nominee for her work

on *China Beach*, Leder downplays the distinction.

"I don't think you can look at this movie and say, 'Well, a man directed it' or 'a female directed it.' But it doesn't come along very often that a female director is offered an action piece. I believe the producers hired me because of the character elements in the film. They interviewed a lot of male directors who do action, but they hired me."

Marked for Murder's stereotypical male point of view betrays no overtly feminine touch, except perhaps for its censor-taunting love scene. The film's writer, Dennis Hackin, offered more substance in his *Bronco Billy*; here his formulated, predictable plot has the solitary female character becoming not only a love object, but a victim as well. Leder herself thought that character could have been "much more dimensional."

Despite the shortcomings of its script, *Marked for Murder* has introduced anti-hero for the '90s who may well return in a series of two-hour movies. If so, the Sandman will cause other TV criminals to lose sleep.

HBO delivers 'Hamlet' trippingly on the tube

That schoolchildren will run headlong into William Shakespeare is inevitable. But to be or not to be comfortable with his legacy is a question most often ineptly answered in English class.

Shakespeare: The Animated Tales, HBO's version of *Classic Comics*, has ably condensed several of Shakespeare's great works to an entertaining half-hour and is a perfect introduction to his writings. Each of the shows is introduced by actor Robin Williams.

Airing Wednesday, Jan. 13, and throughout the month, the *Tales'* dark *Hamlet* conveys the play's powerful themes through visually arresting animation and fiery vocal readings.

Despite its brevity, *Hamlet* loses none of the unsettling moodiness of the original. The sketchy, dreamlike animation (produced by Moscow's Soyuzmultfilm Studios) illustrates with chilling effectiveness the characters' brushes with madness and the supernatural. Shakespeare's poetic prose has never been easier for children to under-

stand than when Ophelia, insane with grief, sings a haunting tribute to her slain father in the echoing palace halls. It's one of many scenes impressionable minds won't soon forget.

Making short work of Shakespeare is an invitation to disaster, but HBO's vivid, authentic *Hamlet* neatly sidesteps the pitfalls. It works, of course, because the play's still the thing.

Steinem adds television to her resume

For most Americans, the name of Gloria Steinem is synonymous with the founding of contemporary feminism. Steinem has been named one of the "25 Most Influential Women in America" by the *World Almanac* for the past nine years.

Steinem's beliefs were shaped in India, where she studied for two years. In that country's caste system, she found many parallels to gender and race relations in the United States.

Steinem's credits as a writer and journalist are wide-ranging. Already an established author by 1968, she helped found *New York* magazine, where she served as political columnist until 1972. Steinem has written three books (including *Outrageous Acts and Everyday Rebellion*) and co-founded *Ms.* magazine in 1973, where she still serves as a consultant.

One of Steinem's more unusual credits is her stint as a writer on the historic mid-'60s NBC news satire *That Was The Week That Was*.

Benchley takes the plunge for ESPN

Peter Benchley's best-selling novel *Jaws* frightened many out of the water 17 years ago. Now, Benchley goes in search of one of the sea's most mysterious creatures, the giant squid, on the latest installment of ESPN's nature-adventure series, *Expedition Earth*, on Saturday, Jan. 16.

While the giant squid may conjure up images of hapless seamen being snatched from the decks of their boats by long, powerful tentacles able to crush entire ships, the squid actually attempts to avoid light and air, preferring to lurk at depths somewhere between 2,000 and 5,000 feet.

To track the elusive squid, Benchley sets out in the waters of Bermuda with guide Teddy Tucker. Benchley and Tucker put out bait and lower an innovative underwater camera and lighting system 2,500 feet into the Atlantic Ocean by cable, monitoring the action from the boat through an elaborate video system. Back on land, giant-squid expert Dr. Clyde Roper examines a specimen Tucker recently found off the coast of Bermuda.

Later in the show, Benchley joins a team of marine biologists documenting the behavior of the giant octopus off the Pacific coast of British Columbia.

Benchley ends his quest near the Caribbean island of Dominica, studying the bulbous-headed sperm whale, one of the few species large enough to feed on — of all things — the giant squid.

Actor Brand a war hero; Lawrence began as class clown

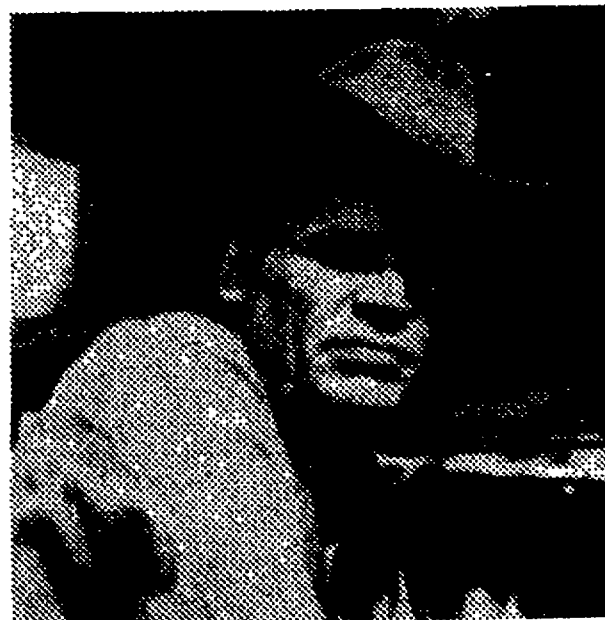

Q: Neville Brand died this past year. Could you please run a story and print a picture of him for us? We were great fans. —Betty Johnson, Crown City, Ohio.

A: Probably best known for his roles in Hollywood crime films, Brand accomplished success in show business that matched his bravery on the battlefields of World War II — heroics which made him the fourth-most-decorated soldier of that conflict. Rather than returning to his hometown of Kewanee, Ill., after his discharge in 1946, Brand chose to study acting in New York and soon landed his first movie role, in 1949's mystery thriller *D.O.A.* His most memorable character was that of Al Capone, whom he played twice: in 1961's *The George Raft Story* and the next year in *The Scarface Mob*. Other roles Brand played include the lead convict in the powerful *Riot in Cell Block 11*; Duke, the POW, in *Stalag 17*; the sympathetic prison guard in *Birdman of Alcatraz*; and Pap, Huck's drunken father, in *The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn*. Brand also portrayed Reese Bennett, the battle-scarred ex-Union soldier who became a Texas Ranger, in the TV series *Laredo*, which aired from 1965-1967.

Q: Actor Ronny Cox, of *Deliverance*, *Total Recall* and *Beverly Hills Cop* fame, starred in a '70s TV series about a family. What was the title of the show and the family's name in the series? What other series has he done? —R.A. Nelson, Portland, Ore.

A: The name of the series, which aired from 1974 to 1975, was *Apple's Way*. In it, Cox played patriarch George Apple. George had moved his suburban Los Angeles family to his ancestral home in Iowa, and the show played off their amusing encounters with the conservative Midwestern townsfolk. Vincent Van Patten and Kristy McNichol, who played two of George's children, were on the cover of every teen magazine at the time. Cox starred in a series a decade later titled *Spencer*, which also lasted only a year. This time, he played George Winger, father to Spencer Winger (Chad Lowe). Almost immediately, Lowe quit and was replaced by Ross Harris, and the show was retooled as *Under One Roof*. Not even summer reruns (with Lowe's Spencer thrown in here and there) could save it from being canceled. One might

also remember Cox as the coldhearted Dr. Gideon, whose appearance in the fall of 1987 on *St. Elsewhere* brought an end to everybody's irreverent fun in that program's final year. Finally, Cox starred in Steven Bochco's embarrassingly bad crime show/musical, *Cop Rock*.

Q: I am a great fan of Martin Lawrence, of the television show *Martin*. My son and I would like some background information on him and an address where we can write to him. —Lisa Moore, Gary, Ind.

A: A big hit for Fox, *Martin* is a sitcom tour de force for Lawrence, allowing him to play characters other than the title one, such as his imposing mother and his oversexed neighbor, Sheneneh. Lawrence's teachers in Queens, N.Y., and Landover, Md., even went so far as to let the budding comedian entertain the entire class with his routines during free time, and they were the first to suggest comedy as a profession for him. He must have agreed with them; he soon won a starring role in the series *What's Happening Now!!*, and has since had his own HBO *One-Night Stand*. Most recently, Martin was featured on HBO's *Russell Simmons' Def Comedy Jam*. His films include *House Party*, *House Party 2* and *Boomerang*. 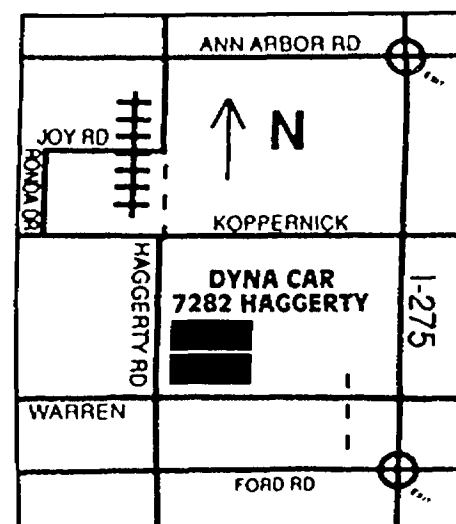

Easy to please wine lovers by tailoring gifts

The holiday season — its glittering ornaments and lights, a cozy fireplace, family, friends and in the evening, while enjoying it all, a taste of fine cognac.

Wine enthusiasts have been smitten by the taste of premium spirits, cognac in particular. If you've not yet become a fan, we're certain you've heard of the "big four" — Courvoisier, Hennessy, Martell and Remy Martin. These houses blanket the world with their product. It can be purchased everywhere. It's good, quite good, but it's only part of the cognac story.

In the Charente region of western France, the cradle of cognac, rests the peaceful town of Jarnac on the banks of the Charente river. Here, life follows the river's nonchalant pace and the rhythm of the vines producing the fruit converted to cognac in the town's cellars.

One dedicated French family has been living in Jarnac and producing cognac before the French Revolution. Cognac A. de Fussigny results from the cognac passion of two people, Alain-Louis and Anne-Marie Royer.

If you know prominent wine industry names such as Italy's Angelo Gaja, Burgundy's house of Faiveley, Champagne Pol Roger, the Rhone firm of Jaboulet and the Trimach family from Alsace, you should now include the Royer's and their company A. de Fussigny. The world's best importers and marketers of fine wine and spirits carry these products in their portfolio.

About one-third of the de Fussigny cognacs are sold in North America. Another third is exported to Asia. The fraction rounding out the production is sold in Europe.

"The best cognacs come from the best wine," Alain Royer contends. "In the cognac region, grapegrowing is as important as distillation techniques." Perhaps Royer's attitude is the reason behind his unique cognac packaging.

"I wanted to have a wine approach," he said. "The label indicates this and the use of the wooden-based cork conveys quality. The A. de Fussigny bottle has no modern imitation. It is a replica of an ancient hand-blown vessel I found in my cellars."

In our opinion, consumers claiming to be connoisseurs, place too much emphasis on cognacs produced from the Grande Champagne and Petite Champagne growing areas. (If you're just beginning to understand cognacs, don't confuse the cognac use of champagne with the sparkling beverage of the same name.) Cognacs blended with large percentages from these regions require years of barrel aging to produce a round, smooth, rich cognac, robust in character yet full of finesse. Understandably, these cognacs are higher priced.

In his entry product labeled Stars Cognac Reserve (\$51.68), he blends 70 percent Petite Champagne and 30 percent Fin Bois cognacs. The average age of the blending elements is eight to 10 years.

A. de Fussigny XO (\$75.96) is a blend of three cognacs: 10 percent Grande Champagne averaging 14 years; 60 percent Petite Champagne averaging 20 years, and 30 percent Fin Bois with an average age of 15 years.

"XO quality is a benchmark in the eye of the consumer," Royer said. That said, you have to taste it to experience the elegant rounded palate expression with floral and violet accents. The smooth finish is unparalleled.

Several other cognacs round out the A. de Fussigny portfolio: Fine Champagne Vieille Reserve (\$106.45) is pure finesse with a dramatic and exciting vanilla character. Heritage (\$151.38) is complex and may be compared to Hennessy Paradis, but with a more evolved aroma.

Tres Vieille Champagne (\$208.51), is a single cask, 1937 vintage. Normally, to be most interesting, cognacs need to be blended. This is an exception.

Go bananas

This versatile fruit adds to desserts, breakfasts

In the early 1950s, the late famed restaurateur Owen Brennan Sr. was creating his dream of the quintessential New Orleans breakfast establishment.

According to his son Jimmy Brennan, who continues with his famous family restaurant in the French Quarter, New Orleans was the major port of entry for bananas shipped from Central and South America, and Brennan Sr. wanted to find a new way to use bananas. Dessert history was made.

Now appearing on international menus from Paris to New Orleans, Bananas Foster was created in the kitchen of Brennan's restaurant patron. Last year, Brennan's served 35,000 pounds of bananas in its famous Banana Foster dish alone.

Chef Mike Roussel has cooked Banana Foster in Russia, Italy, England and Japan, as well as on more than 40 television stations.

His advice is, "Don't be afraid to attempt the dish in your own kitchen. Just remember to wait until the rum gets hot so you'll get a good flame when it's ignited. The dish can be prepared over a regular stove burner and then brought to the dinner table to be flamed."

Brennan's Famous Bananas Foster

4 tbs. butter (¼ stick)
1 cup brown sugar
¼ tsp. cinnamon
4 Tbs. banana liqueur
4 bananas, cut in half, lengthwise, then halved.
¼ cup of rum
4 scoops of vanilla ice cream
Yields 4 servings.

Melt butter over alcohol burner or stove in flammable pan. Add sugar, cinnamon, banana liqueur and stir to mix. Heat for a few minutes, then place halved bananas in sauce and saute until soft and slightly browned. Add rum and allow to heat well, then tip pan so that flame from burner causes sauce to light. Allow sauce to flame until it dies out, tipping pan with a circular motion to prolong flaming.

Serve over vanilla ice cream, then spoon hot sauce from pan over top.

While Bananas Foster is one of New Orleans' most famous (and delicious) creations, Bella Luna's Banana

Bread Pudding with Rum Sauce was spoons-up favorite at the very successful first annual New Orleans Wine and Food Experience, which featured a unique opportunity to sample favorite menu items from the best of New Orleans' finest dining establishments. The wines were pretty excellent, too.

Bella Luna opened in October, 1991 in the historic French Market and features an Italian twist to the Cajun and Creole menu, with a growing reputation as a world-class romantic setting. *Glamour* magazine named Bella Luna as one of America's best "Places to Kiss."

This bread and pudding met my lips more than once!

Bella Luna's Banana Bread Pudding

12 ounces stale French bread, thinly sliced
¼ cup cinnamon sugar (1/3 cup sugar, 1 tbs. cinnamon)

¼ cup raisins
3 bananas (slice 1, puree the remaining 2)
1 ounce plus 2 Tbs. butter
1 cup heavy cream
1 cup milk
¼ cup vanilla bean
3 eggs
Rum sauce (recipe follows)
Yields 6 servings.

Butter and lightly sugar 10-inch cake pan (bottom and sides). Evenly distribute French bread, ¼ cup of cinnamon sugar, raisins, sliced banana and butter (cut into small cubes) around pan and set aside.

Heat heavy cream and milk over moderate flame. Scrape out the insides of vanilla bean, adding both shell and meat to milk/cream mixture. In separate bowl, lightly beat eggs and other ¼ cup cinnamon sugar together. Add banana puree and cream/milk mixture (remove vanilla bean).

Pour custard over bread mixture, making sure all bread is well saturated; sprinkle rest of the cinnamon sugar over top.

To ensure proper baking, place pan containing bread pudding in larger pan filled with water. Bake at 325 F for about an hour, or until firm to touch and lightly browned top.

Serve with rum sauce.

Rum Sauce

1 cup butter
3 eggs
4 ounces water

1 tbs. Karo syrup
4 ounces rum
Yields 6 servings.

Melt butter and mix with eggs. Boil water, sugar and Karo syrup until golden brown. Take off flame and add rum. Pour rum mixture into butter and egg mixture and mix well. Serve warm over Banana Bread Pudding.

Even though it doesn't have any bananas in it, some of the participants at the New Orleans Wine and Food Experience felt that this bread pudding from the Palace Cafe on Canal Street was the best dessert selection. To be completely fair, here's that recipe, too. By the way, the Palace Cafe is brought to you by the finest folks of the more famous Commander's Palace, yet another branch of the Brennan family.

Palace Cafe's White Chocolate Bread Pudding

Bread Pudding
3 cups whipping cream
10 ounces white chocolate
1 cup milk
¼ cup sugar
2 eggs
8 egg yolks
1 loaf French Bread (sliced into ¼-inch pieces and dried in oven)
2 tbs. chocolate shavings (for garnish)
Sauce
8 ounces melted white chocolate
3 ounces heavy cream
Yields 6 servings.

Heat whipping cream and add white chocolate. When chocolate is melted, remove from heat. In double boiler heat milk, sugar, eggs and yolks until warm. Blend egg mixture into cream-and-chocolate mixture.

Place bread slices in baking pan. Put ¼ mixture over bread and let settle. When bread has soaked up mixture, top with rest. Cover with foil and bake 1 hour at 275 F. Remove foil and bake 15 minutes until top is golden brown.

To serve, spoon hot out of pan. Or let cool to room temperature and place in refrigerator for about 45 minutes, then cut into squares or triangles.

To make sauce, melt white chocolate in double boiler, remove from heat and mix in heavy cream. Spoon over bread pudding and sprinkle with chocolate shavings. Note: May be kept at room temperature.

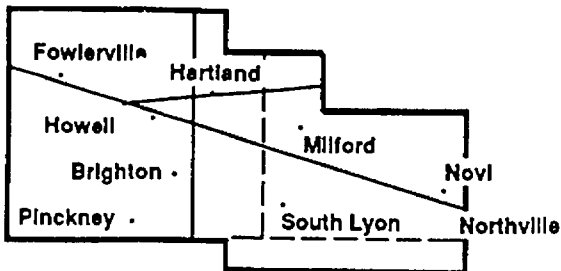
