

Schools anticipate big leap in enrollment

A recent report saying that over 400 new homes will be constructed within the Nine Mile corridor has Northville school officials more than a little worried about growing pains within the district, according to Tom Bailey, administrative assistant for operations.

Several officials, including David Bolitho, superintendent for administrative services; Bailey; dispatcher Barb Strohm; transportation foreman Jeff Wilson; maintenance foreman Bob Minch; personnel director Roy Danley; and secretary Julie Chariet, have been diligently working on options to prevent overcrowding when the student population increases.

A public hearing was held Thursday night to discuss the options. Bolitho and Bailey also gave a presentation on the boundary options at PTSA's Northville Council of PTA-PTSDA. It was there that Bailey reported that 900 homes, including existing dwellings, were currently "on the books."

Bolitho said the district calculated growth projections using the Stanford Analysis, which recommends placing anticipated enrollments into "most likely" and "high" categories.

In the 1993-94 school year, the district projects the following enrollment increase ranges. The first number is the most likely figure while the second numeral represents a high projection:

- Kindergarten - 1, 12
- First grade - 18, 26
- Second grade - 34, 29
- Third grade - 48, 57
- Fourth grade - 16, 24
- Fifth grade - 18, 24
- Sixth grade - 36, 44
- Seventh grade - 7, 2
- Eighth grade - 30, 36
- Ninth grade - 3, 11
- Tenth grade - 34, 39
- Eleventh grade - 8, 3
- Twelfth grade - 16, 11

Parking issue gains board support

About 75 irate Highland Lakes residents showed up at a township board meeting Thursday night to pressure officials into backing their request to restore street parking on Silver Springs Drive.

After some heated discussion on what has become an emotional issue, the township board agreed to back the park.

The group of residents from the condominium association came to the meeting to present a resolution which seeks to overturn a Wayne County traffic order prohibiting street parking on the entire stretch of Silver Springs Drive.

Joe Sattler, president of the Highland Lakes board of directors, read the resolution that was developed by the association and told township board members how the county's order places an "undue hardship and inconvenience" on the residents living there.

Sattler said he believes the residents have been

"good community residents," and in return the county has left them high and dry without parking spaces for their guests.

"We feel it has created an undue hardship and inconvenience to the residents," Sattler said. "Contrary to what others may think, Highland Lakes is concerned about the safety of the residents and of our guests."

"Every year we spend \$12,000 to light the street and another \$6,000 for our own snow removal. The schools and the police call Highland Lakes when there is a problem. . . and Highland Lakes gets nothing back," he said.

Sattler asked the board to back the association's resolution which he hopes will convince Wayne County to rescind its traffic order and restore parking to the east side of the street.

Sattler had a lot of support from a host of angry residents who came to see what the board intended to do about the problem. Their frustration was evident and some even suggested they might sell their homes because of the inconvenience.

"A lot of people are upset and I don't want that

anger or that feeling to get in the way," said Highland Lakes resident Anita Mitzel. "It is the inconvenience of it all but it is also affecting property values."

Renee Totty, 19865 Silver Springs, agreed. "I thought about slapping up the sign but I'm afraid to call the real estate man because I can't tell him where to park," Totty said.

The board unanimously backed the residents' request even though two board members had reservations about the liability the township could incur by asking the county to revoke its traffic order.

"I'm very sympathetic to the residents of Highland Lakes," Township Trustee Gini Britton said. "But if we go ahead and adopt a resolution encouraging Wayne County to rescind the order and if one of these children gets run over by a car, does that increase the liability for the township?"

Township Clerk Sue Hillebrand expressed similar sentiments. She argued that residents of the

Board bickers over options for filling post

Township board members Thursday were unable to agree on whether or how to replace former Township Manager Richard Henningsen.

But until they make up their minds, Township Supervisor Karen Baja will have a deputy supervisor on board to help ease the workload.

Similar in purpose to the deputy clerk's and deputy treasurer's positions, this new position will be a temporary, full-time clerical post intended to ease the paper flow burden. The deputy supervisor will be paid \$11 an hour and will be given a 14-day notice before termination.

Township Clerk Sue Hillebrand recommended the new hire fill the void until the board decides what it wants to do about filling Henningsen's "corner office."

In a single motion, Hillebrand moved for approval of the temporary employee and for acceptance of a plan for studying whether or not the township manager's post should be filled. Her plan calls for the formation of a committee to conduct a thorough study of township government and township management.

Her motion passed 4-3 with Treasurer Rick Engelland and Trustees Barbara O'Brien and Mark Abbo opposing.

"The committee would conduct a study, present its findings and conduct a public hearing," she said. "Then the committee would make a recommendation to the board after the public hearing."

"I'm looking at 120-day framework," she said. "I just feel strongly that we need to look into this and do a good job on it."

Hillebrand's motion found favor with Township Supervisor Karen Baja and Gini Britton, both of whom are unconvinced the township manager's position represents the best-case scenario for Northville.

"This is for discussion purposes only," Britton said. "But I'm not convinced the township manager's position is the way to go. I would like to see a committee formed of board members that goes on a fact-finding mission speaking with staff and other municipalities."

"I think we need to study and evaluate the various options available to

us. I know I have talked to some of the staff who are very excited about Karen's open-door policy and about not having a middle man to report to."

Baja agreed and said that's why she didn't support Township Treasurer Rick Engelland's earlier motion to advertise the opening for the township manager's position.

"I would like us to look at more than a township manager," Baja said. "I want us to look at the whole picture for all possible options in restructuring. I'm uncomfortable to push to go forward to find a township manager."

"I really want to caution us from just taking off. . .," she said. "I'm very against Rick's motion to go out for resumes. . . I'm dead set against it."

Engelland's motion failed 4-3 with trustees O'Brien and Russ Fogg the only ones backing him.

Abbo, Fogg and O'Brien all cited reservations about utilizing Hillebrand's committee process and leaving the township manager's position wide open in the interim.

"I'm interested in finding something that works for us now and in the future," Abbo said. "Is there a real need now to have someone on board or will things fall through the cracks?"

O'Brien said all she really wanted from the deal was a qualified, degreed and experienced professional to fill the manager's job description.

"I would be disappointed to miss out on the opportunity to have professional management," she said.

Fogg also listed some concerns about the manager's position and the need for continuity.

"I'm looking at the township manager the same way I would a police chief or a fire chief," he said. "It provides continuity. And I'm as comfortable with the idea of having a township manager as I am with having a police chief."

"If you experiment with it, I want to evaluate it," he added. "But I am just more comfortable with day-to-day operations being handled by an experienced candidate."

Knowing where Baja stands on the issue, Fogg asked her whether or not she would listen to the committee's recommendation.

"No, I'm going to be the powerful hungry wench some of you think I am," she said.

Township attorney choice on agenda

The township board has narrowed the field of attorney candidates down to three and expects to make a decision on which one will represent the township tonight.

The full board will meet at 6 p.m. tonight at the township hall to discuss the format they will use to interview the three finalists. At 6:30 p.m. board members will conduct public interviews and are expected to make a decision shortly thereafter.

Trustee Gini Britton said the township's current law firm of Law,

Hemming, Essad & Polaczyk, P.C. made the first round of cuts but not the final one.

That's probably good news to Northville Township resident Jan Mueller who urged the board Thursday night to drop the firm.

"I was upset to learn that the current attorney had made the first cut," Mueller told the board. "I think the voters had made their position very clear on that issue."

Mueller cited the firm's connection with the Western Township Utility Authority and other "incestuous" ties as his reason for wanting the firm to be axed.

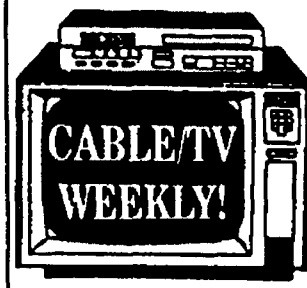

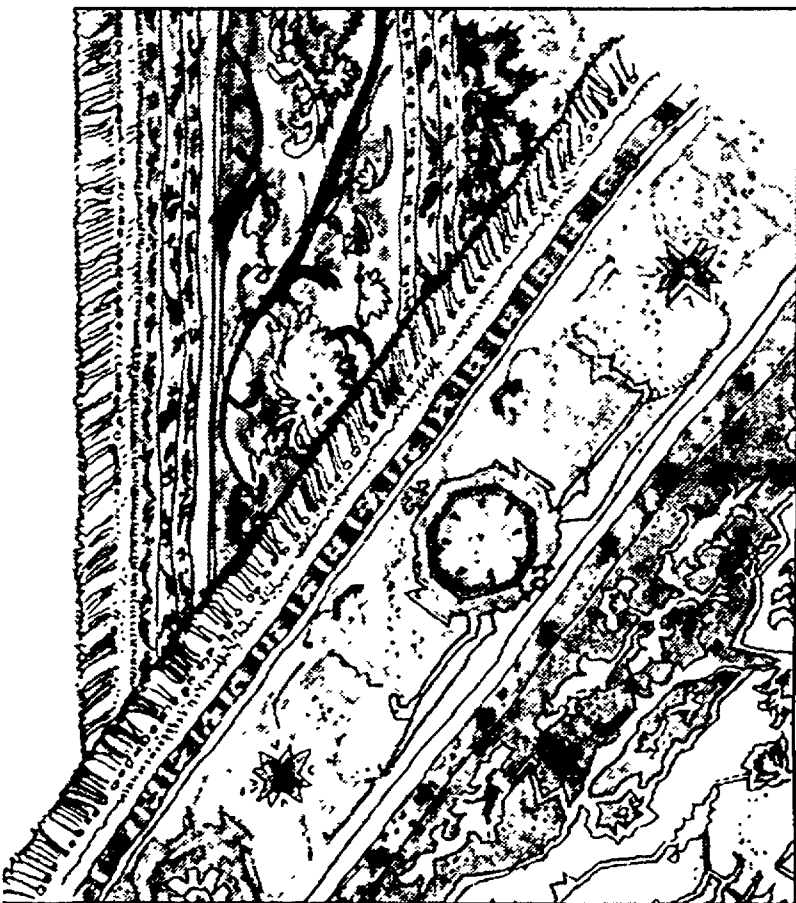

Local student joins future leaders

Jason Jordan has dreamed about being in the military since he was three years old. Now, the Northville High School student is one step closer to realizing that dream.

Tomorrow Jordan will board a plane headed to Washington, D.C. There he will be among 350 of the nation's top high schoolers attending the National Youth Leadership Forum.

The forum is designed for students with high academic achievement records and an interest in a career in the military. For five days students at the forum will get a first-hand glimpse at how the national defense and global security systems work and meet leaders from the Pentagon, The National War College, the U.S. Department of State, the U.S. Naval Academy and the Central Intelligence Agency. They will also be visiting area bases, including the Aberdeen Proving Ground, Andrews Air Force Base, the U.S. Marine Corps Combat Development Command at Quantico and the Naval Air Station at Patuxent River.

That sums up Jordan.

"The military is my ball park," he said. "It is something that interests me. You come into school and, well math's okay, but it's been a life long dream of mine to be in the military. I've read about it and researched it and this just seems like the last time I'll get the chance to learn about it before going into it."

Jordan is hell bent on going into the Air Force. In May, he'll take his physical and in September he'll take his oath.

The idea of meeting some of the key players in Washington appeals to him.

"I'm excited about meeting people at the Pentagon and at the Central Intelligence Agency," he said. "I thought that would be interesting

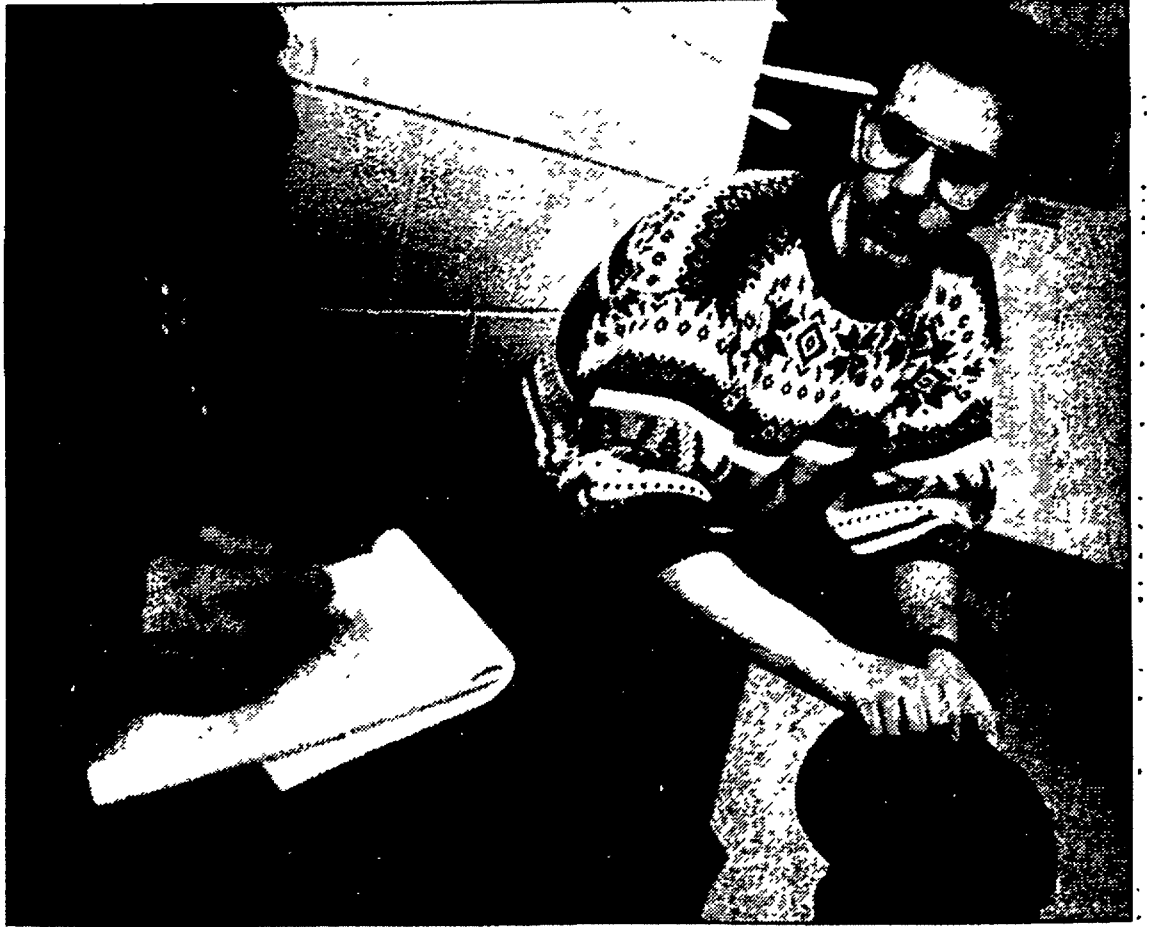

condominium association knew when they purchased their homes they were allotted only two parking places per household.

"You all purchased your homes knowing there would be only two spaces and parking on the street was a temporary situation," she said to the "residents," as they "booed" and hissed. "I'm not unwilling to support this. What I am saying is there may be other solutions," Hillebrand said.

Hillebrand shared Britton's concerns and asked that the board have its attorney review the resolution before forwarding it to the county. The motion, however, died for lack of support.

Wayne County Commissioner

Thaddeus McCotter, who represents Northville Township, offered support for the cause and assured the township that any liability for accidents would rest with the county because Silver Springs is a county road.

"You have no power to remove that order," McCotter said. "And since it is a county road, it is a county liability."

McCotter said if the township presented a unified front to the county there is a chance the commission might overturn the decision.

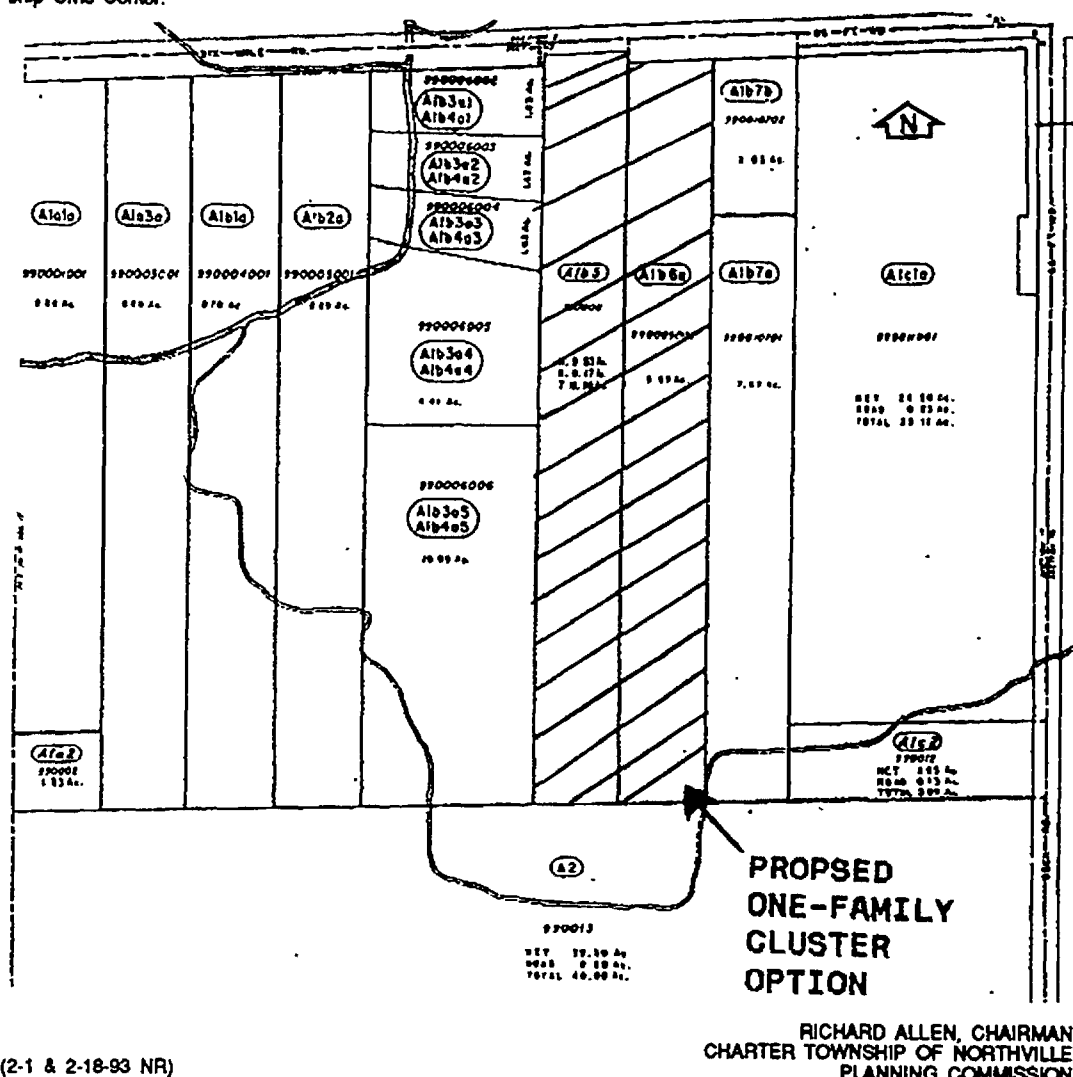

Downtown theft suspect bound over for trial

A Northville man suspected of breaking into a downtown business was bound over to Wayne County Circuit Court Friday, following testimony during a preliminary examination at 35th District Court.

Judge John Garber found sufficient evidence that Joshua Prescott Cogo, 20, might have broken into Meisel's Antiques at 320 N. Center St. sometime between Jan. 9 and Jan. 12. Garber's ruling followed testimony from a 16-year-old Northville youth who said he broke into the store with Cogo.

The youth, whose case has been turned over to Wayne County Juvenile Court, said the two committed the crime sometime between 8:30-9 p.m. Jan. 11.

"We were there to commit a robbery . . . We were just looking around, searching for money," he said. He added that they found nothing.

When asked to identify his accomplice, the boy pointed to Cogo, who was wearing a red flannel shirt and sitting between two attorneys.

Cogo was taken to Wayne County Jail following the hearing, and his bond was kept at \$50,000 or 10 percent. His next scheduled

court appearance is Feb. 12 at Wayne County Circuit Court.

City police suspected Cogo of involvement in the crime after studying an answering machine tape that apparently tape-recorded the burglary as it took place. The 15-minute tape includes the sound of the store being ransacked and two voices. At one point, one of the speakers calls the other "Josh."

Police originally identified the voices as those of Cogo and 17-year-old Aaron Morrison of Northville. Morrison was arraigned on a breaking and entering charge Jan. 15 and sent to Wayne County Jail that day, but city police had him released less than a day later

following Cogo's arrest and an interview with the juvenile.

Asked Friday if Morrison was involved in the break-in, the boy said, "Not at all."

Cogo's attorney, Benjamin Blake, repeatedly asked the boy whether city police officers or other law enforcement officials promised him anything in exchange for his testimony, or whether the boy knew if law enforcement officials had promised his parents anything. He insisted they had not.

But prosecutor Gary LaBret said city police had made a promise to the boy's parents. "The parents have been promised that he will go through the juvenile system and

placed on probation," LaBret said.

Antique store owner Helen Meisel also testified at Friday's hearing, describing how she realized her store had been broken into when she returned on the evening of Jan. 12.

"It was all messed up . . . There were papers thrown all over," Meisel said. "I started walking on broken glass and realized the window was broken."

She added that nothing appeared to have been taken from the store.

The antique store break-in was one of a string of burglaries in downtown Northville over the past month. City police are still investigating whether Cogo and others were involved in the other break-ins.

Phoned-in threat was phony

A Friday afternoon bomb threat and ransom demand at Belanger Inc. resulted in the evacuation of both of the company's Northville buildings as they were searched for explosive devices.

No bombs were found, however, and the ransom demand was not met.

Belanger officials received a call from an adult male about 1 p.m. Friday, said Capt. Philip Presnell of the Northville Township Police Department. "Someone . . . gave the inference that there was an explosive device and they demanded a substantial sum of money," he said.

The business received a second call at 2:25 p.m., and the caller warned that the company had less than 25 minutes to comply with his demands.

The resulting response was a joint effort between the township and city departments. "We coordinated this with the city," Presnell said. "Whatever we found out, they were aware of it."

Fire personnel from both departments were advised to respond to their stations without lights or sirens, and they headed out to both Belanger buildings the same way.

Police and fire personnel cordoned off and evacuated the buildings, at 1001 Doherty Drive in Northville Township and 455 E. Cady St. in Northville City, and a nitrate bomb-sniffing dog from the Wayne County Sheriff's Department was led through both. No explosive devices were found, and the 25-minute deadline passed without incident.

"The money was not paid," Presnell added.

The township police department was still investigating the incident as of Friday afternoon, and police have suspects in the case, Presnell said.

"We're narrowing in on one former employee," he said.

Workshop will focus on learning differences

A workshop scheduled for tomorrow will show educators and parents how to make learning come alive for all students.

Another workshop, scheduled for tomorrow night, will deal with practical approaches to dealing with attention disorders.

Both programs will be presented by David J. Braukman, director of the Southwestern Ohio Special Education Resource Center.

"He's a brilliant guy," said Robert Somson, executive director of special education for Northville Public Schools. "I saw him in a presentation three years ago. He's very well-known, particularly in the area of attention disorders. He's ADD [attention deficit disorder] himself."

The first workshop, "Making Learning Come Alive For All Students," will be held from 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. in the Northville High School forum.

"The first workshop will primarily

be focused on how to adapt the general education classroom to meet the needs of all kids, making learning practical for all kids," Somson said. "It will also be taking a look at what's happening in the very best schools in the world, practices occurring in schools and how we can adopt and learn from those practices."

A variety of techniques to get students actively involved in their own learning will also be shared.

Somson said the lesson of the workshop is that in a general way, good teaching is good teaching for all kids.

"We're learning more about how people learn," he said.

The second workshop, scheduled from 7 to 8:30 p.m. Tuesday, also in the high school forum, will deal with attention disorders.

Somson said there isn't any one definition for attention disorders.

"There isn't any simple answer—it's a complex array of circumstances and situations causing a child to have a problem with attention," he said.

Sometimes hyperactivity can be a

cause, other times it may be depressive or passive tendencies.

"Whatever it is, they all share the common characteristic of having difficulty paying attention," Somson said.

Between 60 to 70 percent of children with attention deficit disorders grow out of them before adulthood, according to Somson.

Both workshops are free and open to the public. To register, call Lola Nestor at 344-8443 by 4 p.m. today.

Teachers called back from lay-off

Trustee Jean Hansen was more than willing to make at least one motion at Monday night's Northville Board of Education meeting.

As chairperson of the curriculum subcommittee, Hansen's motion to continue the Michigan Comprehensive Health Model was met with criticism by some audience members. But that wasn't the case when she moved that the district recall two teachers from lay-off status.

Barbara Hall was recalled to fill a part-time English teaching position at the high school. High school Spanish teacher Lisa Rohde-Barbeau was moved to full-time status and will now also teach English at the high school in addition to Spanish. The recalls were possible due to the retirement of

high school English teacher Michael Tarpinian. He began working for the district in 1974.

Although officials forgot the gavel and board President Carol Rahimi had to improvise by using a musical mallet, the night hit yet another high point when board members were able to participate in a series of presentations put on by Silver Springs students.

After the book "Seven Blind Mice" was read to the board and the audience, board members then visited six learning centers, also referred to as invitation and checkpoint centers, to reinforce what they learned from the book. The idea behind the learning centers is to have the children become active participants rather than passive recipients in education.

Board members spent approximately six to seven minutes at each of the stations, each with its

own goal or objective.

The program concluded with a special presentation where students performed a narration while other students provided a musical background.

Following the presentation, and in keeping with the theme of school board recognition month, board members were allowed to view a book named in their honor with a special nameplate in the front. The seven books will be placed in the seven different schools.

Advocates for Quality Education taped Monday night's meeting. It will be aired from 6 to 9 p.m. Jan. 28 and Feb. 4 on Omnivision's Channel 15; and from 1 to 4 p.m. Feb. 1 on MetroVision's Channel 12 and 2 to 5 p.m. Feb. 3 on MetroVision's Channel 10.

Economist Sowerby eyes mild recovery

Look for the economy to continue to improve during 1993.

That was the message that David Sowerby delivered to the Northville Chamber of Commerce at a breakfast meeting at MacKinnon's on Tuesday, Jan. 19.

A noted economist, Sowerby is a vice president of Comerica Bank.

Sowerby cited growing consumer confidence as one of the reasons for his optimistic economic forecast. Noting that it has been dubbed "the Clinton recovery" by the media, Sowerby said more and more people are signing on to the concept of an economic recovery.

At the same time, the Comerica economist noted that there has been an ongoing economic recovery over the past two years. In April, he said, the recovery will have been in effect for two full years.

The reason the ongoing recovery has not been recognized or accepted by many people, he added, is that it has been moving along at about 50 percent of the speed of normal economic recoveries.

For example, Sowerby reported that Gross Domestic Product (GDP) growth was approximately 6 percent in the late '70s and higher than 8 percent in the recovery in the first half of the '80s. The GDP grew only 2.3 percent during 1992, he said.

Sowerby also noted job growth. Usually there are 200,000 to 300,000 new jobs per month during a normal recovery, he said. During the current recovery, there are about 50,000 to 75,000 new jobs being created each month.

Sowerby said the recovery will continue to gain steam through '93, but predicted that it would continue along at a rate somewhat less than normal recoveries. "Ninety-three will be better, but the recovery will still be only about 75 percent of a normal recovery," he said.

Speaking of the auto industry, Sowerby said he is even more optimistic than the CEOs of the Big Three. The Comerica economist said the Big Three CEOs are predicting 6 percent growth in sales, but that he foresees a 10-11 percent increase.

The Midwest and Michigan will lead the nation in recovery this year, he added.

Schools study plan to change districts

and a second count taken Jan. 8 already showed a four student increase. All four elementaries and Cooke Middle School have seen increased enrollment. Silver Springs reporting the highest jump with six additional students, while Meads Mill Middle School and Northville High School reported a decrease in student enrollment. Meads Mills lost one student while the high school's population declined by 11 students.

Bolitto said building capacities were calculated when nine options were created for the elementaries and five for the middle school. The breakdown, listing the maximum number of students and the current amount, respectively, is as follows:

- Amerman 632, 615
- Moraine 492, 615
- Silver Springs 464, 478
- Thornton Creek 660, 0
- Winchester 548, 520
- Cooke 603, 447
- Meads Mill 742, 525
- High school 1,485, 1,157

"I'm giving you a reader's digest version," Bolitto told members of the PTA-PTSA Council. "Initially we had nine, now we have 10 elementary options. We tried to anticipate where the new kids will come from."

Many new developments are under construction, according to Bolitto. Crestwood Manor, located near Six Mile and Beck, has 126 of its 174 lots still available. Still other developments are either in the planning stages or are yet to be occupied, like Silver Beach Estates which will be located west of Beck Road.

Transportation was also considered in mapping out potential boundaries. Based on a 1.5 mile magnet transportation program, up to 10 buses could be used in transporting elementary students while nine would be used for middle schoolers. Those figures contrast with 13 buses currently being used for the elementaries and eight for the middle school.

"We tried to maintain the subdivisions intact as best we can by looking at the building capacities and looking at the growth in the area," Bolitto said. "There will be a split at Moraine — north of Eight Mile versus the south of Eight Mile. We tried to deal with that. We just couldn't find a way to do that."

Bolitto said several options were proposed to allow for the possibility of "setbacks."

"We tried to analyze this so if we do have a setback we need to have a plan we can use immediately so the board doesn't have to spend the summer coming up with another plan," Bolitto said.

A setback could result from a millage failure. The district is expected to ask for a renewal this year of its 34.15 millage levy which will soon expire. A request for additional millage

is also a possibility.

Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski told PTA-PTSA Council members that it's hard to determine what kind of millage the district will need due to several factors such as property assessments, which may increase after last year's freeze, and proposed executive cuts from the governor which could result in lost revenues to the schools. It is not known at this time how both will affect the Northville district.

"We're not able to factor that in right now because we don't have accurate SEV (state equalized valuation) figures," he said.

Rezmierski said it was important for the district not to act like a "vacuum."

"It's critical we have an option of some plan in place."

Some options, although not desirable in the view of administrators, would involve eliminating "special" classrooms, used for art, health and music, and put those teachers "on carts" where they would wheel their instructional materials into the general classrooms. Or, special classroom programs could be maintained if portable classrooms were brought in. If rented, portable units could cost up to \$9,400 a year, Bolitto said. Two would be needed for Amerman and two would be used at Moraine.

Bolitto told council members that other alternatives would involve closing Moraine and transferring students to Thornton Creek, or not opening Thornton Creek.

If buildings were packed to maximum loads, Bolitto said early childhood programs could also be in danger of being cut.

"Some of these options are not appealing, quite frankly," Bolitto said.

Bolitto said he will listen to all suggestions from parents and residents and make a recommendation for the boundary changes at the Feb. 8 Board of Education meeting, scheduled for 7:30 p.m. at Old Village School.

Whatever the board decides, the plan will have to stick for at least five years, administrators agreed, so students won't be bounced from school to school.

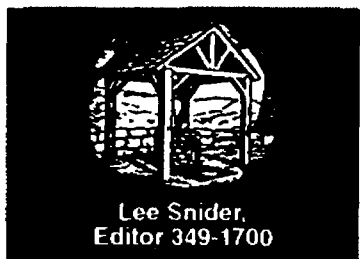
"It (the plan) has to be solid," Bolitto said.

In 1994, the district is anticipating addressing the needs of the middle schools. It is looking to acquire property for a possible new middle school in the Eight and Nine Mile roads corridor. The district currently owns land on Six Mile, Bolitto said.

"Cooke will not be able to absorb that Eight Mile growth," he said. "Thornton Creek will be at capacity. Cooke, you know, in two years will be bulging at the seams."

Assessing efforts pay off for homeowners

The city's chief financial officer, Mark Christiansen, has been criticized in the past for failing to complete a residential reassessment while filling several different roles at city hall.

While that criticism may or may not have been justified, few can fault him for his latest efforts on behalf of the city's property owners.

In his continuing quest to establish fair assessments based on true property values, Christiansen recently rejected a proposed 20-percent across-the-board increase by Wayne County. Instead, he conducted his own "stratified sales ratio analysis" of city properties in Wayne County by dividing the properties into 14 individual sections with similar housing characteristics, whether older neighborhoods like Beantown or Cabbagetown or newer condominium complexes like St. Lawrence Estates.

The sale prices of properties within each neighborhood were then applied to that neighborhood alone, so that they would not skew the overall assessment increase. The result was an average 14-percent increase as opposed to Wayne County's 20-percent proposal.

Some homeowners will no doubt gripe that their neighborhoods are being singled out for unfair assessment hikes. True, their assessments may rise more than they would have under the county proposal, but only because the understaffed county equalization department did not take the time to review sales figures by neighborhood. The county's figures, in short, did not reflect the sales

trends in those neighborhoods as accurately as Christiansen's own stratified analysis.

Assessors are often accused of trying to maximize the amount of tax revenue their municipality receives. But as Christiansen himself points out, his efforts may actually reduce the tax revenue available to the city treasury by reducing the city's total State Equalized Value. Either that or the city will have to seek a larger millage increase to generate the same amount of taxes.

The main problem with property taxes is that they are based on an idle asset. A property owner does not see a return on his or her investment until the asset is sold. Other forms of taxation, like sales and income taxes, are based on the exchange of goods, services or cash which represent an immediate benefit to the recipient.

But as long as Michigan's present property tax system remains in place, homeowners should believe that the system is being administered as fairly as possible.

In Northville City, at least, that seems to be the case.

Taxpayers lost in county game



Michigan law seems clear enough.

"It is the public policy of this state that all persons are entitled to full and complete information regarding the affairs of government. . . (A) person has a right to inspect, copy or receive copies of a public record of a public body. . ."

"If a person asserting the right to inspect or to receive a copy of a public record (in court), the court shall award reasonable attorneys' fees, costs and disbursements. . ."

The Freedom of Information Act was deliberately written in layman's English, not attorney's jargon.

So there should have been no need for Free Press reporter Joe Swickard to sue the Wayne County medical examiner for the autopsy report of a Detroit district judge who committed suicide Jan. 4, 1990.

Wayne County chose to hide the autopsy report. In 1991 Swickard finally won in the Michigan Supreme Court.

Then he had to go through the courts a second time to win attorneys' fees.

Wayne County had the lamest, most harebrained excuse I have ever seen for saying attorneys' fees should be denied.

First, the county said the trial court (Wayne circuit) lacked jurisdiction. Well, you can read the above quoted section of the law for yourself.

Second, the county said Swickard wasn't entitled to attorneys' fees because his employer, The Free Press, a non-party to the suit, financed and paid for the litigation. Naturally, Wayne County was wrong.

This affects Wayne County taxpayers because the county wasted their money on a lawsuit against the public's interest.

Non-residents of Wayne County paid, too, because (1) all state taxpayers pay for Wayne County courts and (2) the fee

case went to a three-judge panel of the Court of Appeals, and those guys make more than \$100,000 apiece, plus their offices in the high-rent districts, plus their clerks, secretaries, files, computers and stationery.

It took the better part of a year, but the Court of Appeals finally told Wayne County to pay up. Said the unanimous opinion:

"We hold that plaintiff (Swickard) was entitled to the attorney fees and costs incurred. The general rule in Michigan prohibits an award of attorneys' fees as an element of costs or damages absent express authorization by statute, court rule or recognized exception. . ."

"Reasonable fees and other expenses must be awarded to a requestor who prevails completely." Signed: Michael J. Kelley, Richard Allen Griffin and Thomas J. Brennan.

The average taxpayer and reader can see how plain, clear and firm the Court of Appeals was.

There is good reason for requiring government to pay attorneys' fees to a person who wins a Freedom of Information Act case. FOIA has extremely weak punishments for public officials who hide records.

A person can collect "actual or compensatory damages," which are hard to put a pricetag on, and charge punitive damages of a mere \$500.

As most chiefs of police will tell you, it's worth the risk to deny a FOIA request and say, "Sue us," because the requestor usually will give up in frustration. If the requestor files suit, the most it can cost government is \$500 — unless the winner can collect attorneys' fees.

One shouldn't need to have the resources of the Detroit Newspaper Agency and the Knight-Ridder chain to pry a county report out into the sunshine. But that's life in cloudy Michigan.

A tougher look at education



I thought the lead on the lead story in last Thursday's edition of The Northville Record was first rate.

The lead story, in case you forgot, was about a new requirement which takes effect in 1994. In essence, the requirement states that all graduating students must achieve a state-mandated score on the Michigan Educational Assessment Program (MEAP) in order to receive a state-certified diploma.

It's part of a program to upgrade the quality of education in this state by trying to make sure high school diplomas mean more than they do today. . . trying to make sure high school diplomas carry some implied guarantees that the graduate has attained certifiable skill levels in math, reading and science.

But back to the lead I liked so much.

In writing the story about the performance of Northville High School students on the 1992 MEAP test, Staff Writer Michelle Kaiser wrote the following lead: "Today, 75 students in Northville are ineligible to receive a state endorsed diploma."

Those are not special education students, folks. The number does not include the 45 special ed students who also would not qualify for a state-endorsed diploma. Those are 75 regular curriculum, main-stream students.

And, quite frankly, the standards that must be reached to attain a satisfactory score on the MEAP test are not that difficult.

And this is Northville. Northville! The place where many of you moved because of the quality of the school district. The place which seems to win state and national exemplary school awards with some degree of regularity.

So why does Michelle Kaiser's lead on the MEAP story please me? Why would I call it a "first rate" lead?

It's certainly not because I want to belittle or deride the Northville schools. I personally believe that Northville does indeed have a very good school district.

And I also believe that our hometown newspaper has a certain responsibility to promote those things in the community which are good.

But the other side of the coin is that for many years I have believed that school districts — yes, even Northville — have been so busy patting themselves on the back that they have failed to look at themselves as critically as they must to insure continued improvement and movement toward excellence.

I believe that school districts have been guilty of painting far too rosy a picture of themselves.

And I believe that newspapers — all newspapers, not just our own — have been guilty of letting them get away with it. . . guilty of looking at school districts through those rose-colored glasses which educators are so proficient at handing out to the media, and which the media is all too eager to put on.

Does this mean I want The Record to start emphasizing the negative in its reporting on schools? Absolutely not.

What it does mean is that I want this paper to look at things objectively. . . to avoid the trap of painting too rosy a picture and, in effect, misleading the public into thinking everything is just dandy — when maybe everything isn't.

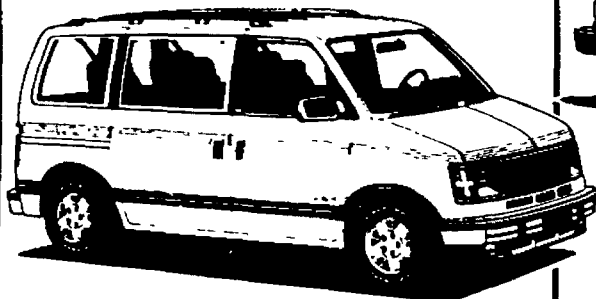
Only then, I believe, can we get around to an objective analysis about the quality of our schools. . . only then can we help focus attention on how to take something good and make it better.

Why shy away from fabulous, fun avocado?

Avocados are often given a bad rap and frequently put in the "foods to avoid" category. They are the only other commonly eaten vegetable besides olives that are high in calories and fat. It's true that a half a medium size avocado contains approximately 150 calories with 88 percent of these calories coming from 15 grams of fat. Don't panic, more than two-thirds of the fat is monounsaturated, the same type of fat that is in olive oil, the "good" kind!

This strange fruit contains no less than 11 vitamins, 14 minerals and protein. Nutritionally the avocado is high in potassium, ounce for ounce containing 60 percent more potassium than bananas. Avocados are good sources of vitamin A and thiamine and fair sources of vitamin C and E, niacin, iron, phosphorus and fiber. An avocado is about 75 percent water and easy to digest. They are nutrient rich, low in sodium and sugar and cholesterol-free (all fruits are anyhow) but this does not mean you should eat a whole avocado daily. What it does mean is that you can enjoy them frequently without guilt.

This strange exotic fruit is a native of Central America but now grown in California and Florida. California's crop peaks during spring and summer while Florida's is from August through October; but they are available year round. The two varieties available here have a smooth green skin or a thick, leathery, pebbly skin that turns dark green to a purple black as it ripens.

Like the banana, the avocado is never allowed to mature on the tree, generally you buy them under-ripe and ripen them yourself. Plan your purchase ahead so there is time for them to ripen for several days. You can hasten the ripening process by putting them in a paper bag.

Choose avocados that are heavy, without dark, sunken or bruised spots. Take the avocado in your hand and just apply gentle pressure. If the fruit yields slightly, it is ready to eat that day. At home you can use a toothpick to test for ripeness. Poke the toothpick in the stem end and if it's eating ripe the tooth pick will glide to the core. The full distinctive flavor of an avocado does not develop until the fruit has softened.

Ripe avocados can be stored in the bottom of the refrigerator for several days. Take a sharp knife to slice around the outside length of the avocado, holding it with both hands, twist in opposite directions for a clean split. Remove the pit with a small rap of a knife blade against the pit and pull it out gently. Once cut in half, place the fruit face down in the palm of your hand and remove skin. The flesh will discolor rapidly when exposed to the air so sprinkle with citrus juice (lemon or lime) to prevent browning.

Whole, diced or sliced avocados do not freeze well, but can be refrigerated a short time. To store partially used avocados, rub the cut surface with lemon juice and cover tightly with plastic wrap or foil to prevent moisture loss, then refrigerate.

The real appeal of the avocado is its mellow, nutty taste and smooth texture. Culinary enthusiasts enjoy creating and using avocado recipes any time of year. Avocados are generally eaten raw but can be added to hot dishes at the very end of cooking. Overcooking will make an avocado bitter.

With the popularity of Mexican food avocados have come alive. Guacamole can be used as a dip or a garnish. Mashed seasoned avocado (guacamole) is great on the top of hamburgers, tacos, burritos, and tostados. To make a quick version of guacamole use prepared canned salsa with the avocado, put it in the blender or

For gourmets on the go Delivery brings best to your door

It's deepest, darkest mid-winter in Michigan. It's cold, it's snowing, the car has a dead battery, and you just won't make it through the night unless you can wolf down a Plata Azul Especial from El Nibble Nook.

Who ya gonna call?

Well, if you live in Novi (east of Novi Road) you can call Door 2 Door, the restaurant delivery service.

Door 2 Door has a direct line into 100 restaurants in the northern suburbs, and has just added a portion of Novi to its service area, along with 10 area restaurants.

Maybe you'd like some pastries from Sweet Lorraine's, or Thai food from the Bangkok Club or the ribs from E.G. Nick's. Whatever the case, you can order from Door 2 Door just by calling the number 288-FOOD.

The minute you place your order, your dinner is being cooked at the restaurant of your choice, ready to be picked up by Door 2 Door's uniformed driver and whisked to your home or office.

It's one of those ideas that somebody should have thought up ages ago. For Door 2 Door founder Kirk Scott, the idea for Door 2 Door started with a phone call in 1987, said Scott.

"I called a friend of mine out in California," he said. "He was a chef in L.A. and was affiliated with a similar service. But it was all done by phone and hand-written orders, with the drivers coming in the back door. He said it would be great if you could computerize it."

"So I took my background in computers, and being in Domino's backyard, I knew the power of deliveries. I founded Door 2 Door in 1988, and started delivering in 1989. It took me a year to write the software program."

Scott's partner is Norman Blemaster, a former consultant for Arthur Andersen with 25 years in the franchising business.

Blemaster points out that computerization gives Door 2 Door the ability to work in volume. The service now offers food from 100 restaurants and covers a 250-square-mile delivery area. Try doing that with hand-written notes and operators phoning in orders.

The computer eliminates the human element from the process. Here's how it works. When a call comes in to the 288-FOOD number, an operator is there to take the order. The operator works from a computer screen which displays the menu from the restaurant of your choice.

You get to see the menu, too. Door 2 Door distributes a quarterly Menu Guide free at each of the restaurants it serves. The Guide lists the menus of each of the 100 restaurants the company serves.

The operator then types in your order, calculates a price which includes the delivery charge and gives you an estimated time of arrival. The operator's computer has a direct modem line into each restaurant. By the time you hang up your phone, your order is already being printed out on a special fax machine in the restaurant's kitchen.

"When I first started this business, my goal was to deliver every order within 45 minutes," said Scott, adding that the majority of his orders take 45 minutes to an hour. "Now we've grown so much that we can't always do that. If it's rush hour, it'll be different. And if there's five inches of snow on the ground, we won't try to kid them. We'll tell them two hours right off the bat."

"The funny thing is, people don't seem to mind. I'll lose only about 10 out of 200 orders that way. Most people will wait two hours for a good meal rather than go out in the snow. I think people know that they're not just calling Domino's, to whip out a pizza and fly one mile to deliver it."

Door 2 Door's delivery system works very similar to a radio-dispatched taxi service. Drivers are sent to certain segments of the company's delivery area, and will wait for a call on the two-way radio. Between runs, the driver will wait in his car in that area, like a taxi at a cab stand. Each car also has an on-board thermal carrier to keep orders warm.

The minimum delivery charge is \$2, plus 75 cents per mile from the restaurant to your door. The average delivery charge is about \$3.50 because, as Scott says, people tend to dine within their own communities, and will

order mainly from restaurants they're familiar with.

But there is no limit on how far a driver will travel within Door 2 Door's service area. If a customer in Novi wants to order from Mon Jin Lau in Troy, they're more than welcome to, though the delivery charge may run around \$10.

The delivery charge remains the same no matter how large your order. There's no minimum order either, which makes Door 2 Door popular with singles.

"You can order \$1,000 worth of food, and it's still a \$2 delivery charge. It's like instant catering," said Scott.

"The difference is that caterers cater from their kitchens, and they're an unknown. With us, you have 100 kitchens working for you. A hundred well-known kitchens."

"And it's a lot less expensive," Blemaster added. "And a lot of people don't know that if you eat your lunch in the office, you can write off 100 percent on your taxes. If you eat out, you can't."

Winter days bring out long-cooking dishes



Sit-on-the-stove-all-day food. Better-the-second-day stuff. The cooking methods and the cuts of meat are what makes these dishes unique. Both dry and moist heat are applied to less tender, and thus, less expensive cuts of meat. These dishes are

often referred to as "peasant" dishes and traditionally have a robust, hearty flavor. Truly winter meals.

Combination methods are most often used for foods considered flavorful, but only after long cooking times. The first step in most cooking of this type is to sear the main item. This would not be the case in, say, chicken pot pie. Searing functions as a sealer for the meat's juices. As the protein touches the hot pan the surface is seared or closed, preventing any of the wonderful juices with all the flavor from escaping. When searing, always have a very hot pan and use a little bit of fat. Be careful of the splattering of fat that will pop out at you.

When braising, the item is then cooked in a liquid medium. Braising is used for the cuts of more exercised portions of an

animal or older, mature birds and fish. The main benefit is that the less tender cuts become tender as the liquid penetrates the tough connective tissues. A relatively small amount of liquid is needed in relation to the size of the main item. Stocks, vegetable juices and wine are examples of good braising liquids. Mixing and matching is permissible.

A bed of vegetables, called a mirepoix, is placed on the bottom of the pan first. This provides additional flavor and moisture to the product. Although braising has been a traditional cooking method for tough cuts, chefs today are using braising on delicate seafood and fish. It is important, in this case, to reduce the oven temperature, cook for a shorter period of time and decrease the amount of liquid.

Braising is a nice low-calorie cooking

technique. The steps to follow are:

- Sear the meat, remove from the pot and sweat a mirepoix of carrots, onion and celery at least. Add others as you see fit, add the cooking liquid, cover the pot and place it in a moderate oven until tender. The longer the item will need to cook the larger the cut of the vegetable should be. Tomatoes are often included in braises as they act as natural tenderizer.
- Add other vegetables to cook with the meat as it nears readiness.
- Save the liquid. Strain and thicken with arrowroot or cornstarch in a cold liquid or as a healthful alternative.
- Puree the mirepoix and return to the liquid.

Stewing is similar to braising and uses the same cuts of meat, but cut into bite size pieces. The technique is nearly identi-

cal also, with differences mainly apparent with the origin of the stew. For instance, a blanquette is a white stew made from white meat, veal or chicken, and is garnished with mushrooms and pearl onions. The sauce is thickened with egg yolks and heavy cream.

Bouillabaisse is a Mediterranean style fish stew. Fricassee is a white stew often boasting dumplings and goulash is a Hungarian stew seasoned and colored with paprika. Ragout, a French term for stew, literally translates as "restores the appetite."

Writing this article has gotten my taste-buds going. Gotta go. Stay warm.

food processor and process to desired consistency. Another popular Mexican avocado taste treat is gazpacho, a wholesome chilled soup.

Mash an avocado, add herbs and spread on garlic bread or corn on the cob instead of butter, this will make your mouth water. Halved avocados can be stuffed, and used as a salad or as a meal. Right now, though, the typical Door 2 Door customer is female, and is ordering from home for more than one person, said Scott. That may seem sexist, but really, he said, it's an example of changing times.

"The woman still seems to have the biggest say in what dinner will be," he said. "But in a dual income family, if the guy doesn't cook and the woman does, he can't force her to cook a meal anymore."

Families with children will often call with orders just for the adults. The idea is that Mom and Dad can fix spaghetti-Os for dinner for the kids, send them to bed, and order sushi from Musashi for themselves. Everyone gets what

they want for dinner, without compromise.

Singles and apartment dwellers are big customers, as are people whose mobility is diminished.

"We do a lot of deliveries to hospitals, blind people, bed-ridden people and handicapped people," Scott said.

With so many options available, Door 2 Door is sure to give pizza delivery options a run for their money.

"We have a real advantage in that pizza is one of the longest items to cook," said Scott. "It takes about 13 minutes to cook a pizza, but with ribs, you can walk in and out in a couple of minutes."

"I feel we're in competition with Domino's."

Glenn Close soars once more in 'Skylark'

MacLachlan's script matches grace of original

Two years ago, roughly 50 million Americans fell in love with *Sarah, Plain and Tall*, making it the most-watched program in the 40-year history of the Hallmark Hall of Fame presentations, CBS is hopeful a similar number of viewers will tune in for *Skylark*, the sequel to *Sarah*, airing Sunday, Feb. 7.

No one could have wished for a follow-up to the Emmy-winning film more ardently than actress Glenn Close. She played the title character, a strong-willed woman from Maine who answers a Kansas widower's newspaper ad to move to the prairie, raise his children and "make a difference" in their lives.

"I loved that character very much," Close says, "and I thought it would be fascinating to bring everybody back...I wasn't ready to say goodbye to Sarah."

Initially, writer Patricia MacLachlan, the author of the novel *Sarah, Plain and Tall* and its subse-

quent teleplay, was reluctant to try a follow-up.

"I find sequels usually stretch and strain the original material," she says. But the enthusiastic viewer response, combined with critical acclaim and the impassioned requests from her leading players, convinced MacLachlan to give it a try.

"Patty, you gave birth to these characters," the writer recalls Close and co-star Christopher Walken saying, "how could you want to explore them further?" They were right."

Skylark begins on a spring morning in 1912, two years after *Sarah* left off, with Jacob Witting, (Walken), Sarah and their children, Anna (Lexi Randall) and Caleb (Christopher Bell), posing for a family portrait. The scene summarizes well the bonding brought by time. "We wanted to show a true progression," Close explains, adding that Walken particularly felt it was "important to show how Sarah had made a difference—what their marriage was

like and that they actually were very happy."

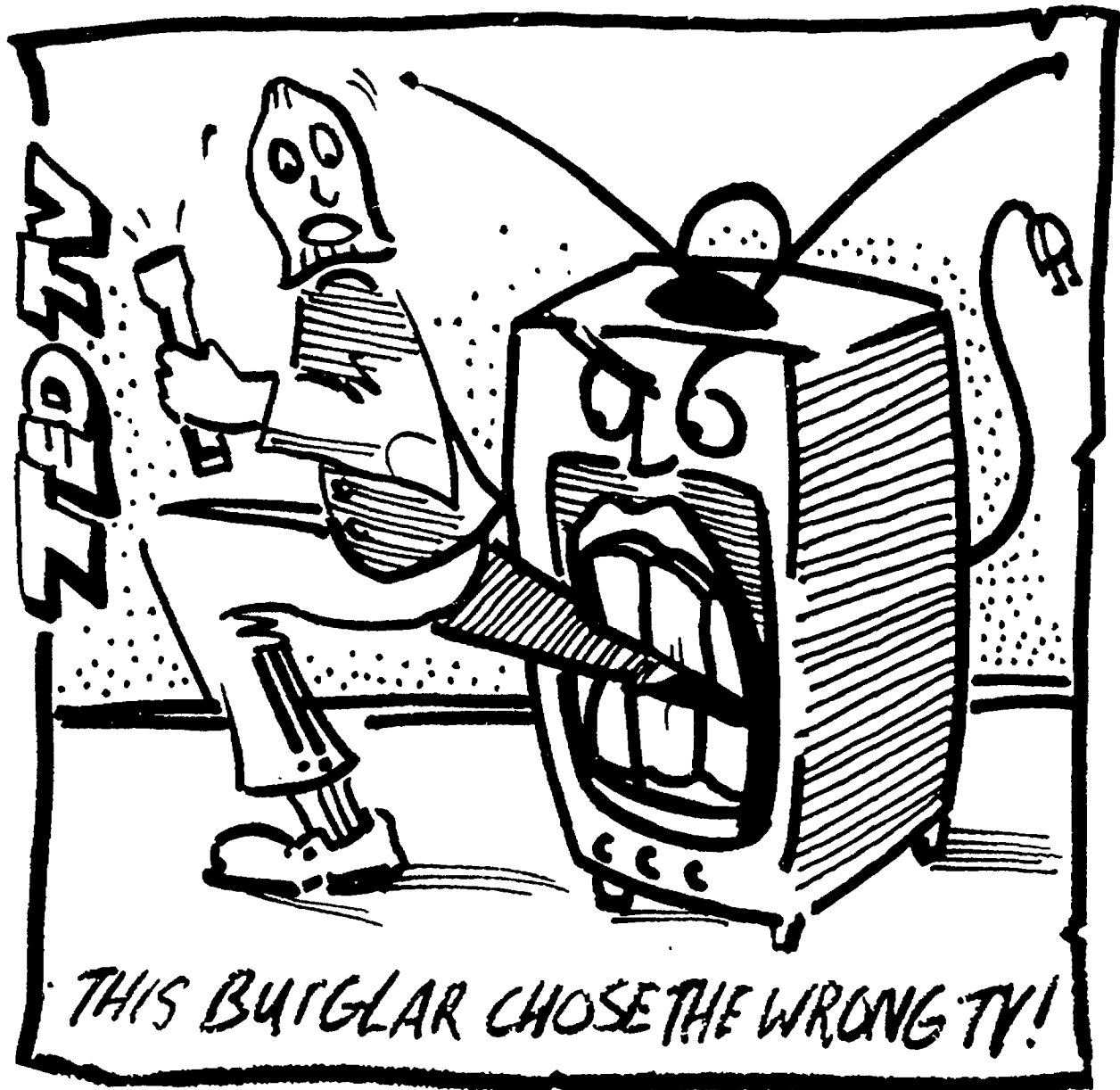
But happiness alone can do little to forestall the hardships of frontier life. As the dusty days drag on, it becomes apparent that a drought has set it.

"What will we do?" Sarah asks one evening, as dangerous, seemingly taunting "heat lightning" flashes across the rainless sky. "We'll manage," Jacob answers tersely, but the fear is clear in his eyes.

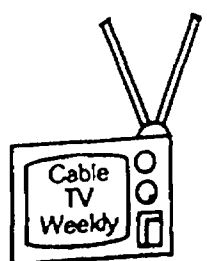
Sarah and Jacob watch in dismay while their crops wither and their livestock grows weak and listless—much like themselves—as water becomes ever more scarce. Even more disturbing is the number of families who simply give up, adding their farms and homes to nature's bitter toll. Outwardly, the Wittings swear again and again to stay on the land no matter what, but doubts and fears remain.

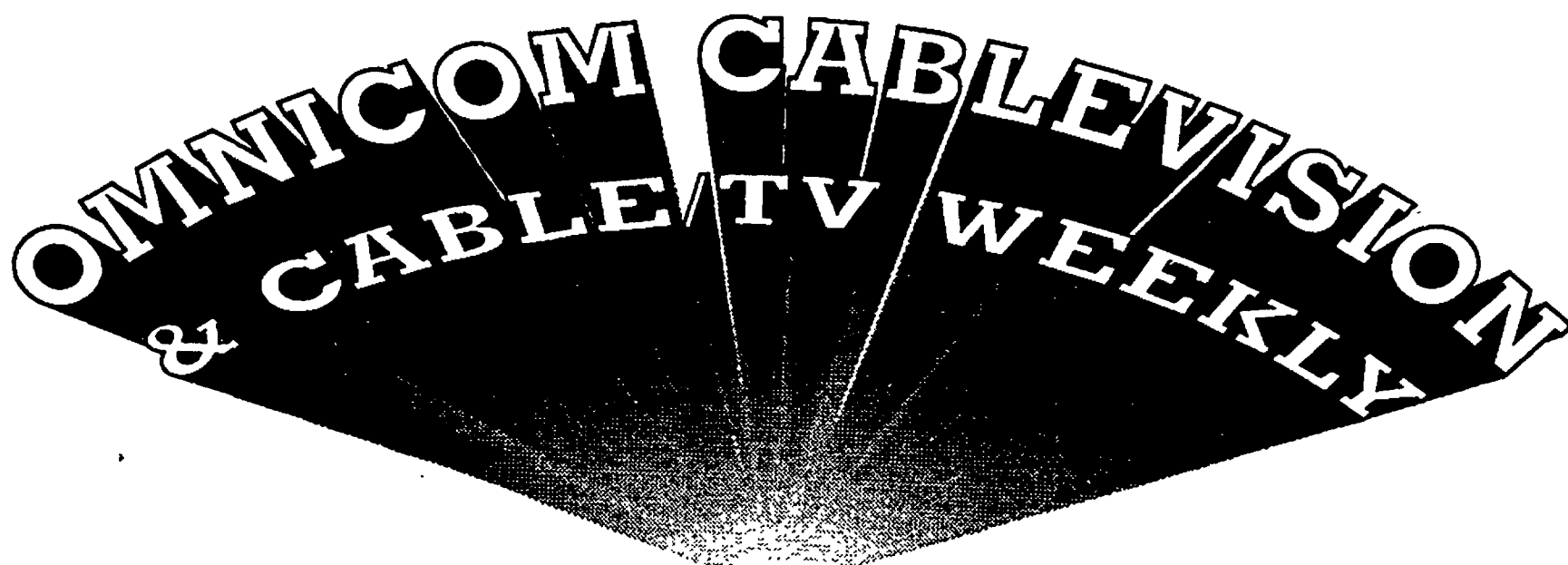
Jacob's resolve crumbles the night he watches helplessly as his barn burns to the ground. The next day, he puts Sarah, Anna and Caleb on a train bound for Maine. The return to her childhood home is comforting to Sarah and a real adventure for the children, but Jacob—alone on the farm—is never far from their thoughts.

In every way *Skylark*, is as well-crafted, graceful and life-affirming as its predecessor. Close clearly loves playing Sarah, and it shows in her luminous, understated performance. Walken is powerful and endearing as a sensitive man who insists he's "no good with words." Randall and Bell have matured as performers and Lois Smith, Elizabeth Wilson and Tresa Hughes offer warmth and humor as Sarah's maiden aunts, better known as "the treasures." Joseph Sargent's direction is excellent, finding just the right tone for MacLachlan's graceful script.

Sports game show debuts on ESPN

A new type of sports game show hits the airwaves Monday, Feb. 1, when *The Dream League* premieres on ESPN. The show, which airs weekdays, is the first of its kind, combining sports trivia with physical challenges designed to give the armchair quarterback a chance at glory.

John Naber, winner of four gold medals in swimming at the 1976 Summer Olympics, is the host of ESPN's first game show, which takes place in the reconfigured boxing arena at Caesar's Palace in Las Vegas.

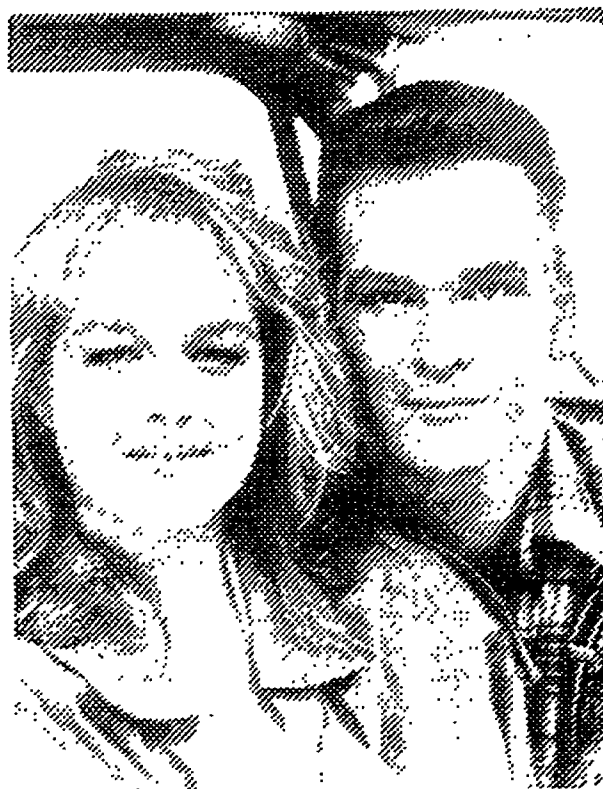
"I know a lot of people sitting around watching sports would like to know what it's like to stand over a \$10,000 chip shot, and this way they actually get to find out," Naber says.

Players are divided into two teams made up of three contestants and a celebrity captain. Both teams start on the endline of a 50-yard football field and attempt to move down the field to score a touchdown and earn cash by correctly answering questions based on

a wide range of knowledge in a variety of sports.
