

Engler's tax cut plan goes for schools' jugular

The Northville School District could lose as much as \$2.4 million in operating revenue if Gov. John Engler's tax cut proposal is written into law.

That's the word from Supt. Leonard Rezmierski, who was in Lansing Wednesday urging lawmakers to think carefully before adopting legislation that would significantly impact school districts across the state.

"It's clearly apparent that they're on a fast track," Rezmierski said of the speed at which the Legislature's moving. "They're going extremely fast."

Engler proposed a 20-percent property tax reduction in his State of the State address last month, and, according to Re-

zmierski, state lawmakers are anxious to gain approval for the measure. Rezmierski and superintendents from several local school associations traveled to Lansing last week to testify before the Senate on the potential effects of the cut.

According to Rezmierski, the proposal could impose a financial hardship on Northville and force the district to delay calling back laid-off teachers. It could also force the continuation of the pay-to-participate program and postpone the restoration of full transportation services, Rezmierski added.

"If we value the things we say we value, our children and their future, we have to look at what we're doing and not keep putting them in peril," the superintendent said.

Northville voters approved a millage renewal last June, but rejected a proposal for a

1.4-mill increase. As a result of the defeat, the district reduced its staffing levels by 10 percent, instituted a pay-for-play athletics program and reduced its busing distance radius.

As a result, classrooms are crowded, some students are missing out on sports participation and many parents have had to provide their own children's transportation to and from school, according to Rezmierski.

"We've got some secondary classrooms with as much as 38 to 40 students and some of our upper elementary classes have 33 or 34 children. That's unacceptable."

Rezmierski added that the pay-to-participate program which is due to expire at the end of the current fiscal year, June 30, might have to be extended if the tax cut plan goes through.

Engler's proposal would phase-in a 20-percent property tax reduction over three years, with a 10-percent cut planned for the first year. It is only one of five or six tax reduction proposals now being reviewed, but, according to Rezmierski, it is the one finding most favor with legislators. The superintendent thinks lawmakers might be trying to ram the proposal through before homeowners receive their tax notices later this month.

Rezmierski said support for the measure is sharply divided along party lines, with Republicans in favor and Democrats opposed.

Lawmakers are reportedly considering replacing the revenues school districts would lose by asking voters to approve increases in the state sales and/or income taxes. He added, however, that such proposals will

likely be rejected at the ballot box, and even if they passed, cutbacks would still have to be written into next year's budget, planning for which must get under way in April.

Rezmierski said school associations are proposing other ways of reducing costs that would have less of an impact on school districts' budgets. The potential loss to Northville represents roughly 10 percent of the district's \$23.5 million budget.

"If we don't do this right, we're going to see more districts faced with financial bankruptcy like we're hearing about in Ypsilanti and Kalamazoo," he said.

The school board is expected to discuss the tax cut issue at its meeting at 7:30 p.m. tonight.

O'Brien leaves board deadlocked on new attorney

Northville Township might have had a new attorney on board at this time if trustee Barbara O'Brien had not been allowed to abstain from voting on the selection of a candidate last Monday.

Even though O'Brien wasn't willing to comply with state law requiring her to clearly disclose her reasons for wanting to abstain, the full board permitted the abstention anyway.

After three consecutive paper ballot votes without O'Brien's participation, the board was deadlocked in trying to make a decision on two of the three final candidates.

According to the minutes of the meeting, O'Brien didn't state a clear, definitive reason for wanting to abstain.

"My feeling is that my vote could be perceived as favoritism," O'Brien told board members after petitioning for

her abstention. "I just don't want to be any part of it."

Despite the inadequacy of the explanation, board members voted to allow O'Brien to skip the vote.

According to Clerk Sue Hillebrand, O'Brien's reason for abstaining was too vague. She said her first inclination was to vote against the motion that allowed the abstention.

"I wanted to vote no at first because I wanted her to disclose the reasons why," Hillebrand said. "I wasn't satisfied with what she said and I wanted to know exactly what it was."

Hillebrand said she didn't vote no because she didn't want to inconvenience the attorneys who were waiting in the lobby to make their pitch to the board at the meeting.

"She (O'Brien) walked in at 6:27 p.m., and we had firms waiting, and I knew that if I voted no we would be in

Committee revisits attorney selection

The Northville Township Attorney Selection Committee met Friday afternoon to decide where to go now that the township board is deadlocked over their options for a new attorney.

The five-member committee had narrowed the field of bidders from 25 to three. Those final three — Howard & Howard of Bloomfield Hills, Vandever Garza of Detroit and Kelly & Kelly of Northville — made final pitches for the account last Monday to the board of trustees.

At that meeting, the board allowed Trustee Barbara O'Brien to abstain from the vote and wound up three times in a 3-3 tie between Howard & Howard and Vandever Garza.

Township Clerk Sue Hillebrand said early Friday afternoon the committee was reconvening to explore its options.

"We are just meeting to decide where to go," she said. "The committee may look at making a definitive recommendation to the board of trustees and ask them to accept it or we may look at other options. I'm not sure how we'll go yet."

Hillebrand said the outcome of last week's meeting proved frustrating because O'Brien's vote could have broken the tie. She said the biggest problem she has with the whole matter is that O'Brien was one of the two board members who asked to interview the candidates, but then opted out.

"We gave this board an option," she said. "We polled everybody (on the board) and asked them how they wanted to handle it. With Russ (Fogg), Karen (Baja) and I excluded because we were already on the committee, two of the board members wanted to just vote on it based on the committee's recommendation and two others wanted to interview the firms."

She said O'Brien was one of the board members who wanted to interview those firms. But at the last minute she abstained, causing a snag in the process that has delayed the hiring of a new firm.

"We need to move ahead with this," said Township Supervisor Karen Baja Thursday.

Baja said she hoped the committee would reach an accord Friday so the board could vote on the issue at this Thursday's regular board meeting.

Hillebrand regrets giving O'Brien the nod to abstain

a 20-25 minutes discussion about it."

Hillebrand said in hindsight she wished she had voted no so O'Brien would have been forced to either disclose her conflict or vote on the issue.

"I still don't feel comfortable not knowing what the conflict is or if it was because she didn't want to make a tough decision," she said.

Some of O'Brien's board col-

leagues had tried to pry more information out of her. When asked whether casting her vote for any of the firms could bring her financial gain or if she had worked with any of the firms before, O'Brien refused to comment.

"No, I don't wish to explain anything for anybody . . .," she said. "I'm very interested in the ethics of the situation and this is where I am. I wrestled with it all day and I just feel in my heart this is the right thing to do."

"I don't think it is financial. I don't think so," she said. "But it could be construed as favoritism."

Supervisor Karen Baja was surprised by O'Brien's request and said Michigan township law requires a voting member of the board to give a reason for wanting to abstain. Beyond that, the full board must give its unanimous support to allow a member to abstain.

"It must be unanimous that the board allow it," Baja said. "Legally she has to explain it. You cannot just

not vote because it's a controversial issue."

Baja said she wasn't willing to pursue the issue with O'Brien because of the disagreements the two have had in the past. She feared her persistence would have been perceived as another salvo in their ongoing dispute.

While the board was willing to give O'Brien the right to abstain from voting on the issue because of what O'Brien called a "perceived conflict," they were also lenient concerning the

long-standing friendship Baja has had with an attorney from Howard & Howard, one of the finalists for the post.

Early in the selection process, Baja had disclosed to the township's Attorney Selection Committee that she is friends with Leonard Kruzyznak, the lead attorney who would represent Northville if Howard & Howard was awarded the township's account. According to the minutes of the meeting, Baja said her husband, Glenn, and Kruzyznak were class-

mates in the Dearborn schools. She said Kruzyznak had never represented either her or her husband in any legal matters, but he had attended one of her political fundraisers.

At the time she disclosed that relationship, the five-member attorney selection committee, which narrowed down the bidders to the final three, had agreed the friendship would not be a conflict of interest. The board backed the committee's action and let Baja vote on the issue.

CHILD PASSENGER SAFETY AWARENESS WEEK: Not using proper child restraints or improperly using child restraints while driving can lead to disastrous results. This is part of the reason that this week has been declared Child Passenger Safety Awareness Week.

During 1991 in Michigan, 55 children under the age of 15 were killed in traffic accidents while 9,658 were injured, and motor vehicle crashes were the number one cause of fatal injuries in that age group. An in-depth 1986 study by the University of Michigan Traffic Research Institute showed that even though 75 percent of children under four were using restraints, nearly 63 percent of those were used incorrectly. And incorrect use of child restraints nearly doubles the risk of injury.

Michigan State Police urge motorists to buckle themselves and their children up. Under the state's 1982 Child Passenger Safety Law, all passengers ages 15 and younger must be buckled up no matter where they sit in a vehicle.

Task force targets drug abusers

There's no question that drug use among local schoolchildren has alarmed Northville parents.

The question is how to answer the alarm.

Community leaders hope to come up with some answers during an "exploratory meeting" this Wednesday, Feb. 10, at Gentili's Hole-in-the-Wall Restaurant.

The 8:30 a.m. meeting, of a new "Community Task Force on Alcohol and Drugs," is being coordinated by

John Farrar, executive director of the Community Commission of Drug Abuse. The commission is an umbrella organization that includes the Northville, Livonia and Westland counseling centers.

"One of the functions of our agency is to be involved in what the state refers to as prevention services among alcohol and drug addictions," Farrar said.

Farrar noted that most drug awareness efforts typically revolve around schools. "But this problem really transcends schools. It's a local

problem, a parent problem, a police problem . . ."

The latest effort to address the problem involves "calling on a broad brush or spectrum of civic, business and community leaders, as opposed to just leaving it to professionals like us or the schools to do something," he said.

The community-based task force can allow local leaders to develop a "game plan" to tackle drug abuse from a different angle, he said. "It's really a strategic planning exercise."

Northville's top elected officials, Mayor Chris Johnson and Township

Supervisor Karen Baja, drafted a letter to other community figures asking for their help "to promote a lifestyle free from the overuse and abuse of alcohol and drugs in this community . . . We are looking for an interested and committed cross-section of community leaders to work together in addressing this issue because we believe that the synergistic effect of our joint efforts will be far more productive than the efforts of just a few committed individuals."

Developer pushes revised library plan

The Northville Library Advisory Commission on Thursday reviewed Southfield developer Pete Zervos' plan to refurbish the Ford Plant and rent out part of it for a new community library.

But the plan may be due back to Ford Motor Co. too soon for the community.

The plant proposal has been modified since Zervos first pitched it to reluctant city and township officials late last year. While his original proposal provided for a second-floor 25,000-square-foot library and 10,000 square feet of additional meeting space on the ground floor, revised plans call for a 25,000-square-foot library on the ground floor and the additional meeting space may not be offered.

The rest of the space would be leased to two other tenants, reportedly an insurance firm and a medical facility attracted by the concept of a community center.

Zervos said the changes, which

are tentative, are designed to make his plan more affordable for the community. City and township leaders had balked at the \$39,000 monthly leasing fee included in his first version.

"We restructured things where the outside tenants would be paying a lot of the costs that the library would have paid," Zervos said. "And we're talking to Ford too; we told them they had to contribute something."

Zervos' consortium of investors, known as the Northville Development Group, is also under increasing pressure from Ford to strike a deal for the plant.

"I know they have two factory people who have been pushing them to get into the building," said Northville Development Group member Ted Fox. "They're trying to accommodate the city first . . . They're fighting for your side but the poor guy in charge (of selling the plant) is getting real beat up."

Library commission members were anxious to hear how much the space in the Ford Plant would cost them, but Zervos failed to answer di-

rectly, saying he needed to know what a new library would require in terms of finished space.

"We need to know what you need," he said. He suggested setting up a subcommittee to determine the community library's functional requirements, financing requirements, what can be afforded, what can't be afforded, whatever."

The suggestion was echoed by one from library commission member Lynn Parkilan, who recommended setting up individual subcommittees to focus on three areas—the site for a new library, fundraising to pay for a special election, and public education.

"It would seem that the site committee needs to get to work right away," Parkilan said. "And in the interests of all the community, we have to look at other sites that have been suggested."

Parkilan cited downtown's Open Door Christian Church, which is for sale, and the First Baptist Church at Randolph and Wing as other potential sites. The First Baptist congregation is reportedly moving to a new site

on Eight Mile and Napier.

Once a preferred site is selected, Parkilan said, it could be presented to the community at a public hearing. She suggested the annual Friends of Northville Public Library meeting March 20 as the logical forum for the presentation and to take public feedback on the proposal.

A second public hearing would be called to review the financing plan for site acquisition and to provide the operating budget of the district library.

Some at the commission meeting questioned the placement of a library in the lowest level of the Ford Plant, but Library Director Pat Orr noted that it would be similar to the library's current home in city hall. "The lowest level of the (Ford) building is very similar to the way that the library sits now in that part of it is below grade and part of it is not."

The library commission also passed a resolution Thursday setting up a district library agreement. The passage follows approval of the agreement by the city council and township board.

Township needs more bodies to fill new boards

With the property tax freeze thawing this year, Northville Township is anticipating a heavy workload for the township's board of review.

That's why Township Supervisor Karen Baja is hoping to employ a second board of review running simultaneously with the first board to handle residents' tax appeals and questions. But in order to get that plan in action, the township needs residents to fill the second three-member panel.

The three members of the first

panel are Geri Dodds, Zo Chisnell and Ann Robson. Chisnell is the only reappointment to that board.

Township Clerk Sue Hillebrand said the township is currently accepting resumes and applications from residents interested in filling seats on the second of review or on the newly-enacted ethics board.

Hillebrand said the second board of review would handle the overflow of cases during the tax hearing dates on March 2, 8, and 9. During those three days the board will hold day and evening hours to hear tax appeal requests and answer residents' property tax questions.

In order to qualify for a board position, applicants must be registered

voters and a resident of the township for at least 30 days. They also must not be in default with the township.

Township officials are also looking for residents to sit on the ethics board. As a member of that three-member board residents will serve in an advisory and proactive capacity to inform township employees, elected officials and contractors on potential conflict of interests. Board members will also advise township personnel and contractors on matters that might even appear to be conflict of interests.

In order to qualify prospective board members need to be a resident of the township for a year, have references and be a United States Citizen.

The board will enforce the ethics policy adopted by the township board in December. It will meet quarterly or more often if needed. Hillebrand said filling the three seats on the board is vital.


"I think it's vitality important because it's a further checks and balance system for township employees, contractors and elected officials," she said.

Hillebrand said she has received some resumes for both boards, but not enough. She said she will be accepting them through February. Members of the ethics board will be appointed through a random lottery system at the board's March meeting.

More downtown businesses entered, tool found

Several more downtown businesses were broken into in the past week according to city police reports, and a possible burglary tool was found outside one of the sites.

Expert to speak on cultural diversity

"I know the work they're doing," she said. "I think they're very important because I think they set the policies for their community. People have power in numbers."

Lara is currently studying for her doctoral degree at Michigan State University's School of Social Sciences. She volunteers at WDET-FM in Detroit, where she has directed and produced the award-winning *El Grito De Mi Raza* (The Voice of My People) for the past 12 years. She also contributes regularly to the Detroit Free Press Advisory Board on parenting issues. In addition, she co-

founded the Michigan Standing Committee on Multi-Cultural Mental Health Issues and Michigan Hispanic Mental Health Association.

Lara has won several awards for her human services work. In 1986 she received the Pathfinder Award from the Detroit Council of Christians and Jews for excellence in training cultural awareness to human service providers. She received the Diamond Award from Michigan Women in Communication in 1984 for establishing a radio program that enhances the image of women in society.

In 1987, Lara was awarded the Pioneer Award by the Michigan Corporation of Public Broadcasting Association for her outstanding contributions to public radio via WDET.

Alcohol factor in Jan. 18 township fatal accident

Police say an unlawful blood-alcohol content and excessive speeding were factors in a Jan. 18 fatal car accident in Northville Township.

Officer Matthew Mayes said an autopsy report filed by the Wayne County Medical Examiner reported the victim, Randall Hammers, had a blood alcohol content of .18 percent at the time of the accident.

In Michigan, a person with a blood alcohol content level of .10 is deemed intoxicated.

The officer said that although a specific speed had not been determined, the victim was traveling in excess of the speed limit. The area is posted at 45 miles per hour.

Hammers, 29, was about 200 feet from the entrance to his apartment complex, Cedar Lake Circle, when the early morning accident occurred.

The victim was westbound on

Six Mile when he lost control of his 1989 Toyota Celica near the curve east of Waterford Court. He crossed the center line and drove into the eastbound lane near the curve when he collided with an eastbound 1989 Oldsmobile Toronado, according to reports. Hammers' car slid sideways with his passenger side striking the front of the Toronado, before travelling partially over the top of the eastbound car. The Toyota came to rest upside down on the north shoulder of the road.

Mayes said officials at the scene measured 412 feet of skid marks which Hammers had made prior to the collision.

The two people in the Toronado escaped injury, though no one involved in the accident was wearing a seat belt. Mayes said a 0-percent blood alcohol content confirmed the driver of the Oldsmobile had not been drinking prior to the accident.

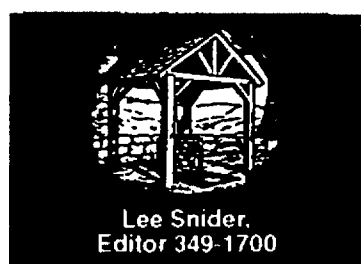

Trustee's abstention not well thought out

The Northville Township Board of Trustees last Monday held a special meeting to interview representatives of the three firms that had qualified as finalists in the search for a new township attorney. A vote was to be taken immediately afterwards. The interviews went ahead, then the trustees began their deliberations, discussing the comparative strengths and weaknesses of three applicants.

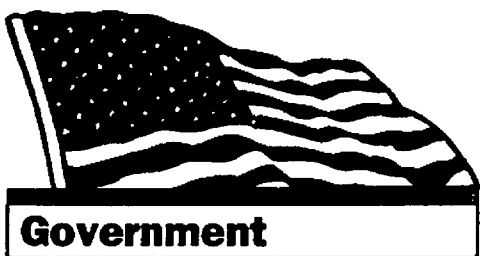
When it came time to vote, the board was unable to come to a consensus due to the abstention of trustee Barbara O'Brien. With O'Brien declining to vote, the board was left with a six vote scenario, and, as it turned out, three trustees went with one firm and three voted for another. The third firm received no votes.

Due to the deadlock, the matter was referred back to the special committee that had been appointed to recommend a new attorney for the township. The committee was expected to review the issue again and see if it couldn't come up with a fresh recommendation the board could agree on.

That the township must wait a while longer before knowing the identity of its corporation counsel is not a serious problem; the business of the township, barring an unforeseen legal complication, should continue to get done more or less as before. However, a disturbing procedural breach occurred during the meeting that allowed O'Brien to opt out of voting.

Whenever an elected official endeavors to be excused from a vote through abstention, he or she is required to explicitly state the reason for not wanting to vote. That person's colleagues on the board are then permitted to analyze the rationale given for the abstention then take a vote on whether to allow it. Unanimous agreement is required before the representative may be permitted to abstain.

This procedural mandate is more than a mere courtesy, it is a legal requirement that has been written into the rules



of order to prevent the abuse of the abstention privilege. If elected officials were allowed to abstain whenever the spirit moved them, representatives would be able to beg off voting for any number of self-serving reasons, including a cowardly avoidance of controversial issues.

O'Brien was evasive in explaining herself after she requested permission to abstain. Her reasons were vague and ill-defined, and she said little more than that her vote might have been construed as "favoritism," and that she "didn't think" her conflict was financial.

These might have been sufficient reasons for asking to abstain from voting if O'Brien had been more expansive and specific. Why was there a chance her vote might have been perceived as favoritism? What did she mean when she said she wasn't sure her motives were not financial? Didn't she know for certain?

O'Brien's failure to provide an adequate reason for not voting should have been a signal to board members that a more in-depth questioning was needed. However, insult was added to injury when, for the sake of speeding things along, board members gave her the unanimous vote she needed to sit mute on the sidelines while the six other representatives cast their lots for the candidate of their choice.

We hope that township board members will be more diligent in the future and make sure that trustees asking to abstain from voting provide reasons that are both thorough and sound. Voting on issues is what the trustees were elected to do, and if they ask to be excused from that obligation they have a responsibility to be direct in telling the public why.

Task force tackles drug education effort

The results of last year's Alcohol and Other Drugs School Survey made it painfully clear that Northville has a drug problem.

In the survey released last September, for those who may have forgotten, more Northville High School seniors claimed to drink alcohol and do drugs than their counterparts across the country. The statistics were frightening — 42 percent of local seniors said they'd used illicit drugs, as opposed to 35 percent nationwide. And more than half of the Northville seniors polled said it would be "very easy" for them to get their hands on marijuana.

These results came despite the commendable efforts of groups like the Student Assistance Program and Northville Youth Assistance to provide counseling and role models for at-risk youth, and Northville Action Council's ongoing awareness-raising efforts through programs like "Red Ribbon Week" and "Safe Homes."

Northville Public Schools are active participants in the battle against drug abuse as well. A full 298 of the 399 lessons in the K-8 Michigan Model for Comprehensive Health deal with substance abuse prevention.

School officials hope to test the success of the Michigan Model, which was only fully implemented during the 1991-1992 school year, by comparing the results of this year's Alcohol and Other Drug survey against last year's results. But those officials have come

under fire recently for not incorporating other programs like DARE into their curriculum.

The sad fact is that all the school-sponsored programs in the world will not eradicate drug abuse. In short, a broader coalition is needed to address the growing threat.

That coalition may start to take shape Wednesday morning in the cellar at Genitti's Hole-in-the-Wall Restaurant. It's there that local leaders plan to discuss formation of a Community Task Force on Alcohol and Drugs. The coalition promises to turn the response to drug abuse into a multi-pronged one, and we applaud all involved for taking the initiative.

John Farrar, executive director of the Livonia-based Community Commission of Drug Abuse, is organizing the coalition as a way to spread the responsibility for drug abuse prevention around. He notes that the onus for drug awareness typically falls upon schools and school-related organizations, but that the effects of drug abuse impact everyone in the community.

We couldn't have made the point better ourselves, but we'd also take Farrar's observations one step further. The ultimate responsibility for drug awareness lies with parents themselves.

Hopefully, Wednesday's meeting will begin to get the message across that we cannot rely on schools alone to educate our children.

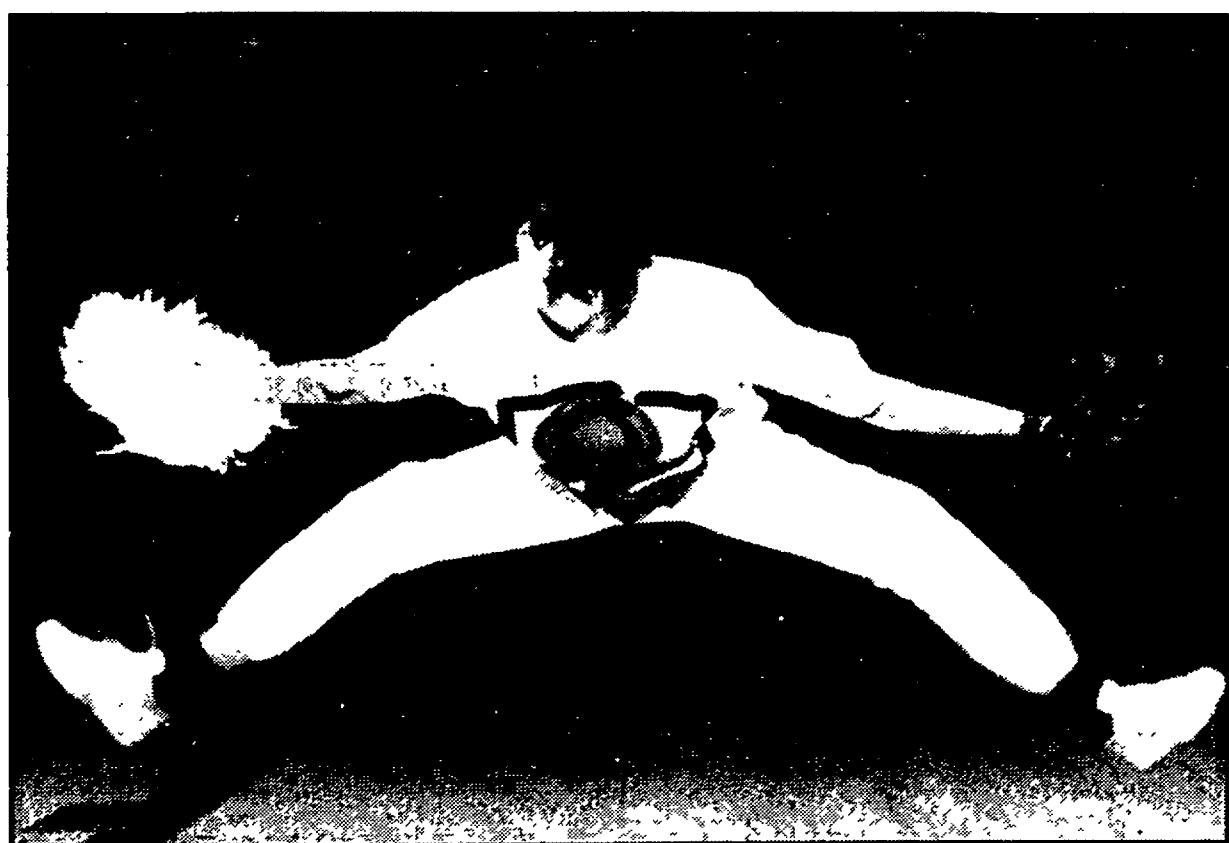

Phil Jerome

No 'hit-and-run' artists here



The really big boss, Phil Power, owner of Suburban Communications Corporation, was the keynote speaker at the Novi Chamber of Commerce's annual installation dinner last week.

And the subject of his talk was, appropriately enough, community journalism.

Just to put this in perspective, The Northville Record is one of six papers published by HomeTown Newspapers. And HomeTown is a division of Suburban Communications Corporation.

Now back to Mr. Power's speech. He talked about the difference between the dailies and hometown community papers. I wasn't at the dinner but I have heard the boss's thoughts on this topic before.

In essence, it breaks down to the fact that the big city dailies show up for the tragedies and scandals and then race back to the relative safety of their desks, not having to worry about having to face the people they reported on until the next time there's a scandal.

I sometimes call them "hit-and-run" artists.

With us community journalists there's a fundamental difference. When we cover a tragedy or report on misdeeds in government or blast somebody in an editorial, there's no place to hide. We have to stick around and face the music. We have to meet the person or persons face to face at the next board meeting . . . or when we see them in church . . . or at the video rental store.

Sometimes, we have to call and talk to them the very same day the sensitive story or editorial appears in the paper as we go about the process of collecting news for the next edition.

This unique aspect of the job of a community journalist

has created some very uncomfortable situations over the years . . . not just for me. For everyone involved with The Northville Record.

What makes the job even tougher at times is when the person who is the subject of the sensitive story or critical editorial happens to be a friend.

I happen to be pretty good friends with Ed Kriewall, the Novi City Manager. He was a new city employee at the same time I was a rookie reporter. All of a sudden one day, he was the city manager and I was the editor.

That doesn't mean we're not still friends; it means that we've had some rather major disagreements over the years. He does his job; I try to do mine — and sometimes they just don't mesh.

Kriewall even went to the aforementioned Phil Power on one occasion to complain about the editorials I had been writing about him. No problem; we're still friends. I thought it was classy of him to tell me in advance that he was going to my boss.

Not all the battles involve sensitive stories and tough editorials, however. As community journalists, we take it from all sides. One of my personal misfortunes is that my sister-in-law is president of the Northville Mothers' Club. And she has no compunction whatsoever about telling me when she thinks we (I/the paper) have done something wrong.

And then there's the anonymous person who identifies himself only as "another seventysomething" who has taken it upon himself to proofread the paper every week and send me all the clippings.

Does it sound like I'm complaining? I'm not. I love it. I like the fact that we're right here in the community . . . that you have immediate access to us, and we to you. To my way of thinking, that proximity makes us better, more responsible journalists.

Officials delay boundary decision for now, more community input sought

Northville's assistant superintendent for administrative services has recommended the district delay any decisions on 1993 school attendance boundaries, at least for the time being.

David Bolitho had planned on recommending a final plan to the board of education at tonight's meeting following citizen input from a public hearing held Jan. 28. Issues raised at the hearing changed his mind, however.

"Prior (to the public hearing) we wanted to decide as carefully and as expeditiously as possible to get ready for the opening of a new school," Bolitho said. "But after presenting a packet at the coordinating council and all the questions they had, I realized there are a lot more questions on

the opening of Thornton Creek and general district finances.

"At the public hearing, there was a lot of positive feedback, a lot of excellent questions and a lot of insightful input into the school district. There was a lot of things that came up in these meetings that made a lot of sense."

So, Bolitho and his team went back to the drawing board. The first step was to confirm demographics — how fast are surrounding subdivisions being constructed? What are the limitations regarding wetlands and woodlands in the area? What are the projected water and sewer completion dates?

"There's yet so much more to do," Bolitho said. "It may take a month or five to six weeks. During that time I'll be able to do my homework and the community will have a chance to digest options."

One change Bolitho already made

was in projected building capacities. He took a parent's suggestion and listed two elementary maximum student populations, the first denoting students with designated special subject classroom spaces (art, health and music). The other figure refers to the maximum amount of students without designated special subject classroom space — in other words, art, music and health teachers would instruct from mobile carts. The respective maximum populations are:

- Amerman — 632, 716
- Moraine — 492, 548
- Silver Springs — 464, 548
- Thornton Creek — 660, 884
- Winchester — 548, 660

Bolitho said the boundary delay may give the district more time to learn how the governor's tax cut plan, or any other school reform plan, would affect Northville.

"Some of those cuts may be detrimental to Northville Public Schools," he said. "So maybe we're putting the cart before the horse."

Bolitho said the boundaries will be discussed at one more public hearing as well as at several facility subcommittee meetings. No official dates have been set for those.

"This is a big issue," he said. "What school your child goes to is very important."

Out of the numerous options, Bolitho said, ultimately, some parents will be unhappy with new school boundaries.

"We won't be able to please everyone," he said.

The administrator did urge parents to give their input, however, at the upcoming meetings.

"This process isn't going to be as quick as we thought it was going to be," Bolitho said. "We are interested in any thoughts from the community."

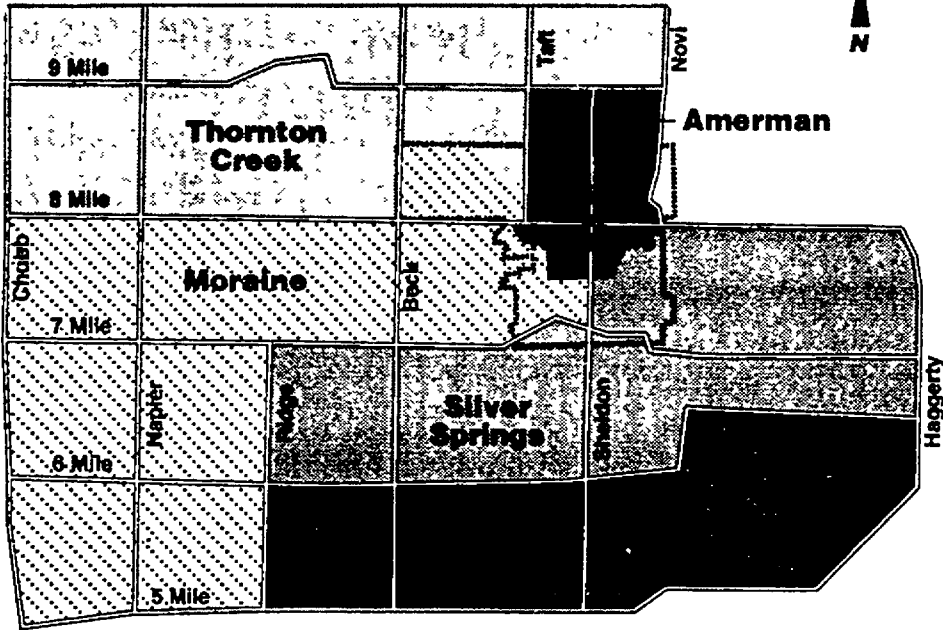

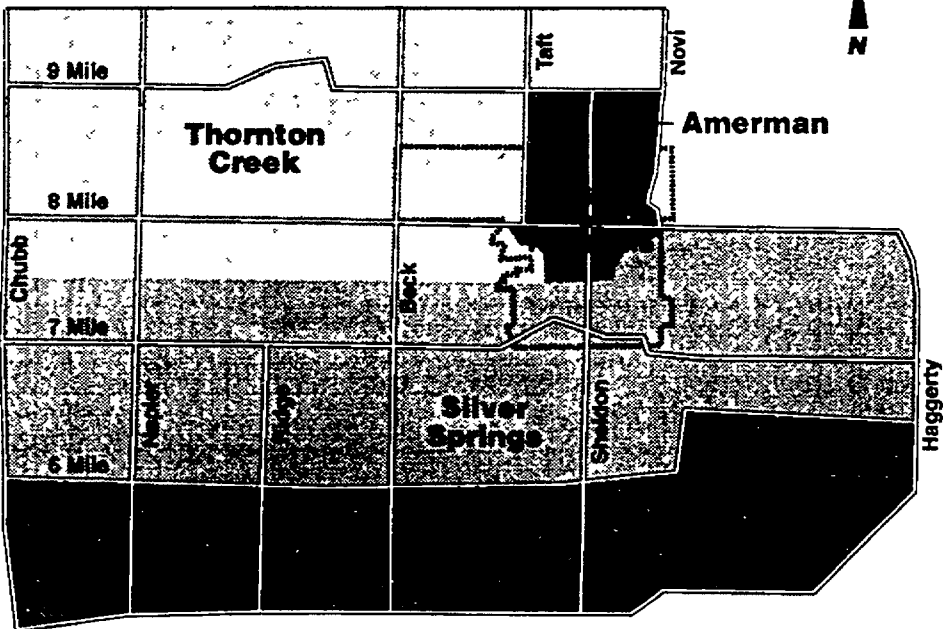

Importer finds new flavors in obscure labels

Did you ever yearn to be the first to stumble upon something new, different and exciting? If so, then you'll appreciate the story of Peter and Maria Weygandt and their discovery of virtually undiscovered wine -- undiscovered, that is, until they began the business of importing it to the United States four years ago.

Peter Weygandt caught the wine bug while in law school in New York City. He read about wine extensively and became a frequent visitor to Manhattan's fine wine shops.

He and his wife, the former Maria Metzler, who is fluent in French, began taking trips to France's wine regions. They delighted in discovering wines that were not available in the U.S. and decided to obtain an import license. They formed Weygandt-Metzler Importing Ltd., a veritable cottage-industry importing firm operating out of their Unionville, Penn., home.

The soul of Weygandt-Metzler is France's small domaines. These wines are new entries into the Michigan wine scene. So new, in fact, that the first shipments arrived last week. If you've been stuck in a rut with your wine-drinking habits, make a resolution to discover new tastes from some estate producers you've probably not heard of before.

Master Sommelier Fran Kysela, who for his tender age of 35 years has a vast knowledge of French wines, is national sales director for Weygandt-Metzler. This spring, he will become a partner with the Weygandts and the company name will be changed to include Kysela.

Kysela, who makes his home in Virginia, is no stranger to Michigan. He did his Master Sommelier internship at Detroit's Whitney and the now-closed London Chop House.

"Basically this is what we do differently from other importers," he said. "We work with producers who practice green harvesting. We label all unfiltered cuvees with the phrase 'Non-Filtre' and we deal in smaller, more select quantities."

"We believe the world's finest wines are being produced by small domaines whose commitment to quality exceeds the economic pressures to produce the most wine possible. Over the years, these domaines have had a loyal following of private customers. Until now, their small size is the only reason the American market was not introduced to these estates. Some of these estates have been shaken by generational changes in winemaking leadership and are awakening from a Sleepy Hollow period to become zealous winegrowers."

Both the Weygandts and Kysela are interested in showcasing wines with fruit. "We're going to develop a company motto," Kysela said. "It will probably be something like, 'Down with oak, up with fruit.' So many of today's wines have their beauty ruined by the excessive use of oak. Oaky wines don't pleasantly harmonize with food and they don't age well."

One of the elements that appealed most to us, as we tasted through many of the Weygandt-Metzler wines available in our market, was the crisp edge of the white wines that will pair them especially well with seafood.

WINE SELECTION OF THE WEEK

1990 G. Durand Chateau La Bastide Corbieres Rouge (\$8) hails from a southern French wine region near Narbonne. You'll be hearing more about Corbieres as it becomes more widely discovered over the next several years.

Be among the first to taste it in this area. It's made predominantly from syrah with about 20 to 25 percent carignane and a small percentage of mourvedre. This is a rustic French country wine for heavier wintertime foods. The peppery yet fruity grip in the finish will not let you forget the name of Weygandt-Metzler, the wine's importer.

Proving ground

OCC teaches would-be chefs the ropes

Spotted about Oakland Community College's Orchard Ridge Campus are students in black and white checked pants, double breasted white jackets, scarves and floppy white hats. With determined looks on their faces, they head for Building J.

"Who are they and why are they going there?" many ask. If the inquisitors were to follow the students in question, they would be in for a pleasant surprise.

Up the winding stairs on the third floor, the Ridgewood Cafe makes its home.

Overlooking the innovative architecture of the campus, this window-lined dining room is filled with tables topped with crisp linens and blossoming flowers. At the entrance stands the professionally dressed host whose warm smile welcomes every guest. Throughout the room, the waitstaff graciously takes orders, fills coffee cups and serves food worthy of a five-star restaurant.

Scents from the adjacent cafeteria and retail bakeshop start the mouth watering as guests can hardly wait for a basket of freshly baked rolls.

Menus printed daily run the gamut of heavenly gourmet delights at earthly prices. A choice of four dinner entrees, one

soup du jour, one featured salad and a salad bar, one specialty sandwich and a full sandwich board are yours to choose from.

A meal might start with Cream of Potato and Leek Soup (\$1), followed by Coq Au Vin with Duchesse Potatoes (\$4), and finished with Lindzer Torte (\$1). For a lighter fare, Grilled Caesar Salad (\$3.80) or Salmon topped with Shrimp and Mussels (\$4) might be your fancy.

Does this sound like a typical college campus to you? It shouldn't. Students not only prepare and serve this food, they run the entire business of the restaurant. The Ridgewood Cafe is a product of the Hospitality Departments' students and staff. The Department offers Associates degrees in the Culinary Arts, Restaurant Management, Hotel/Motel Management and also runs a Culinary Internship Program.

The program is one of only 35 in America to be accredited by the American Culinary Federation Education Institute Accrediting Commission. Not many campuses can claim to have a department diverse enough to accommodate all of these different areas while maintaining such elaborate facilities.

For 13 years, the restaurant has been in business, Monday-Thursday, 11 a.m. to 1 p.m., during the school year. The restaurant is actually a classroom with first and second semester students starring as the

staff. The food is prepared by students in the Culinary Arts programs in the kitchen on the first floor.

First and second semester students prepare the four entrees, salads, sandwiches and baked goods, while third semester students in the Advanced Pastry class lay claim to the intricate, sweet delicacies made daily. Fourth semester students in the Classical Cooking class prepare the entree entitled "Health Special," which provides a leaner choice or ethnic special.

First and second semester students in the Culinary Arts program attend six classes per semester. Each class lasts 10 school days, then students move on to the next area of concentration. Those areas of concentration include bake shops, garde manger, storerooms, hot foods, demonstration lab and the dining room. Each skill learned is applied and honed through the hands-on curriculum, as the aim of the classes is to replicate a private establishment.

The goal of the dining room class is to expose future managers and chefs alike to all aspects of the industry. Each student gets a turn as a waitperson, host, busser and expediter/manager. Second semester students receive training in table-side cooking and pouring of non-alcoholic wines.

The class is taught by Darlene Levin-

son, herself a former manager. For 12 years she worked in the industry, opting eventually to instruct aspiring students. Returning to her alma mater (she has an associate's degree from OCC in business), she runs the restaurant without a hitch while teaching students the ins and outs of the business. From accounting to table arrangement, Levinson molds the once-rough students into seasoned professionals.

"Many students in the program are studying to become chefs and have never had experience working with guests in a dining room setting. For those students to become successful in the kitchen, they must learn to interact with the guests for whom they are cooking," Levinson said. "Keeping in touch with guests and co-workers is one of the most important skills a chef can learn," she adds.

Third semester Culinary Arts student and cook at The Townsend Hotel, Stephen Dunne, reiterates the benefits of the course.

"Serving in the dining room helped me get the whole picture," he said. "Teamwork in the industry is imperative for survival and that is emphasized in this class. Dining room helped everyone understand the position the waitstaff and the manage-

Indulge yourself with an elegant night out



I must be getting old... time flies by faster and faster.

The days seem like hours and weeks as days. There just isn't enough moments to do all that I want.

An exception was last week when I was lucky enough to eat meals from two of the finest chefs in Michigan -- and quite probably in the United States -- a dream come true for a person such as myself. On Wednesday, we joined Tom's brother, Pat, and his lovely bride, Joyce, at the Lark to help

celebrate their 25th wedding anniversary.

This was their first visit and our second. The Lark is a definite special occasion restaurant, or business expense dinner. Believe me, it is worth every dime. Jim and Mary Lark are the proprietors and are present every evening to greet and visit with their guests. They remind me of ourselves, only in a more formal setting. They, along with their chef, Marcus Haight, once again made memories happen.

The meal is "Prix Fixe", meaning that the price includes appetizer, soup or salad and main entree. The signature entree is the rack of lamb "Ghengis Khan." Each lamb rack is numbered and a copy of the registration and recipe is served with every order.

This visit I indulged in Abalone, a gastropod mollusk indigenous to the Califor-

nia and Mexico coastlines. The edible portion is the adductor muscle, a broad foot by which the abalone clings to rocks. It's iridescent shell is a source of mother-of-pearl. I enjoyed my meal tremendously, as did the rest of our party. What's not to love... great wine, food, atmosphere and friends?

Francis, our "regular" waiter was great, as usual. I'll need another lark "fix" in six months or so.

Our next treat was dinner presented by R.I.K.'s restaurant and Cloverleaf Market featuring the awesome talent the Tapawingo staff. Chef Harlan Perteson, Mickey Bakst, dining room and wine coordinator, and Chef Rick Halberg with their respective crews did a marvelous job. The food was exquisite. Very rarely do I love everything, but it wasn't hard in this case.

Marty and Marsha Burke, our dear friends and the owners of Dunleavy's, in Farmington, were our table-mates. The plate presentations were fantastic, service incredible and the wine to die for. The perfect evening started with hors d'oeuvres of a shrimp tamale, venison carpaccio with caesar dressing and mahogany quail.

The accompanying "salads" of julienne carrots and peppers and a curried onion compote were refreshing. An appetizer of rare-seared yellowfin tuna "chili" with ginger black beans was my favorite. Wonderfully spicy with a great blending of flavors.

A salad of mixed greens, in a walnut bread "basket," with a smoked garlic vinaigrette followed. Very nice. The principle dish, a peppered rack of lamb with roasted corn ragout and crispy-creamy potatoes was almost heaven. The meat tender and

tasty, the corn perfection and the potatoes lovely.

What more could you ask for? Dessert. Now this was a true finale to an already fabulous meal. Named Lemon "in Degrees," it consisted of a frozen lemon-almond terrine, warm lemon souffle, and lemon zest mousse garnished with a crystallized lemon slice, raspberries and a tuille crescent cookie.

A 1987 Raymond-Lafon Sauternes was the wine, for the course. An exemplary evening. We were very fortunate to speak with Mickey Bakst, during the meal, and thrilled to let Chef Pete Peterson know face-to-face how outstanding the food was. Incredible!!! It is going to be hard to eat out after these two extraordinary evenings.

¾ cup chopped onion
1 cup chopped green bell pepper
1 clove garlic, minced
2 teaspoons vegetable oil
2 cans (14½ ounces each) stewed tomatoes or Cajun-style stewed tomatoes, undrained
1 can (13½ ounces) low-salt chicken broth
1 to 2 teaspoons Creole seasoning
¾ package (4 ounces) No Yolks cholesterol-free noodles

1 cup frozen cut corn
2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley

Cool soup carefully to keep it safe

"Winter winds and cooling snowflakes may inspire you to cook up a large pot of homemade soup," says Silvia Treitman, home economist for the Oakland County Cooperative Extension Service. "But, improper cooling can be a potential source of food poisoning," adds Sylvia.

An old wife's tale that has been passed from one generation to the other has made many people believe that it is not a good idea to put hot food in the refrigerator until it is thoroughly cooled, for fear of it turning "sour." This myth is confusing and dangerous. Leaving food out for longer than two hours is a real no-no.

"We get lots of calls from distressed cooks who have accidentally fallen asleep and left their large pot of cooked food sitting out all night because they were afraid to put it into the refrigerator too soon," adds Sylvia.

Here are some quick ways to cool foods safely:

● Take large pot off burner when food is cooked. Stir entire contents with a large utensil frequently during first 10 minutes of cooling.

● Set large pot of cooked food in a sink or large pan of ice water to hasten cooling.

● Divide contents of pot into several smaller containers no deeper than about 2 inches in depth.

● Refrigerate the smaller containers quickly allowing plenty of space in the refrigerator for air circulation. If food is to be frozen, divide into freezer containers and allow ample space in freezer. Food should be refrigerated promptly.

● Do not leave cooked food out until it cools completely itself. It may take many hours for a large pot of soup to cool and by this time it may have grown bacteria which can cause food poisoning.

ment is put in when there is a dilemma in the kitchen."

Keeping the program current is another aim of Levinson's.

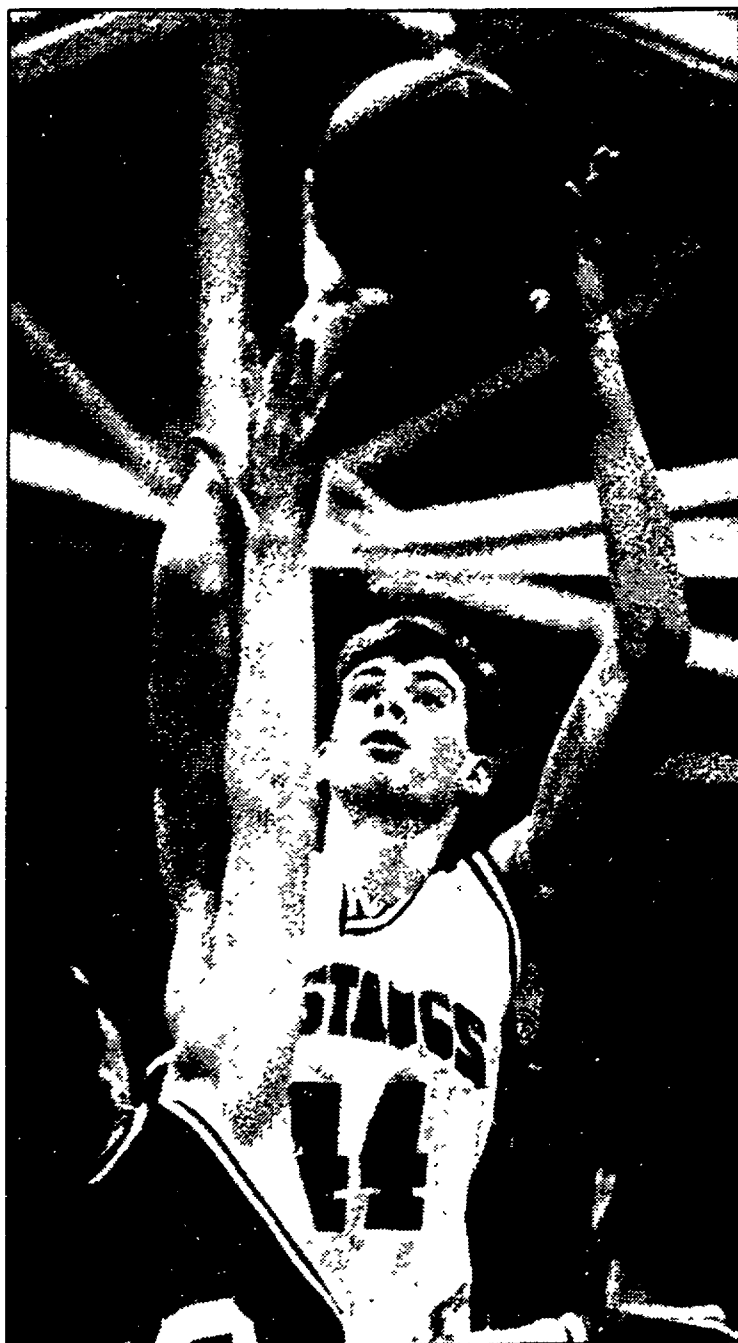

Northville falls 65-58 to Salem; playoff hopes hurt

James Head scored 12 points in the fourth quarter to lead Plymouth Salem past Northville Tuesday night, 65-58.

With the game tied at 54 and just more than two minutes to go, the Rocks pulled away from the host Mustangs. Head sank a pair of free throws and made a critical steal and slam dunk to seal the win.

"He's very tough," Northville coach Larry Taylor said. "He's very good inside and can shoot from the outside, too."

The loss left the Mustangs at 2-4 in the Western Lakes Activities Association. With half the conference schedule gone, Taylor said his team must start winning if they are going to finish in the top eight.

"Our goal is to make the upper division playoffs," he commented. "We have to stay focused every time out now."

Tuesday's game featured top performances from a pair of unheralded Mustangs.

Junior Neil Yackle scored eight points, including four straight at the end of the first half to give Northville the lead. Fellow junior Josh Williams played his best game of the season with 13 points, including a slam dunk.

"It was by far his best game," Taylor said of Williams. "He took the ball in the post and shot right over Head a couple of times. It has to be a real confidence boost to him. We were really pleased with his effort."

Northville dominated in the opening minutes Tuesday.

Mike Maschek tipped in an in-bounds pass from John Farrar for the game's first points at the 6:45 mark. The Mustangs held a 6-3 lead

when Head made his first appearance.

The junior put Salem ahead on a three-point play with 30 seconds left. The Rocks held a 12-9 advantage at the end of the period.

Mike Slone hit a three-pointer from long range to give the visitors a 21-13 lead with 5:30 to go in the half. Williams scored and Yackle followed with a pair of free throws to cut the lead in half.

The junior scored about a minute later on a backdoor layup and Salem's lead was down to 27-24. Yackle scored again and then Williams followed with a layup at the buzzer to give Northville a 28-27 lead at the half.

The Mustangs played a zone defense much of the half, seemingly frustrating Salem. Taylor said he had a couple of reasons for the zone.

"I don't think we matched up well with their big people in terms of quickness," he said and added, "We played zone to cut their penetration (to the basket)."

Northville's lead quickly vanished in the third.

Brandon Slone, Sanj Seth and Mike Slone scored in the first 1:30 to put the Rocks up 34-28. The Mustangs turned the ball over twice dur-

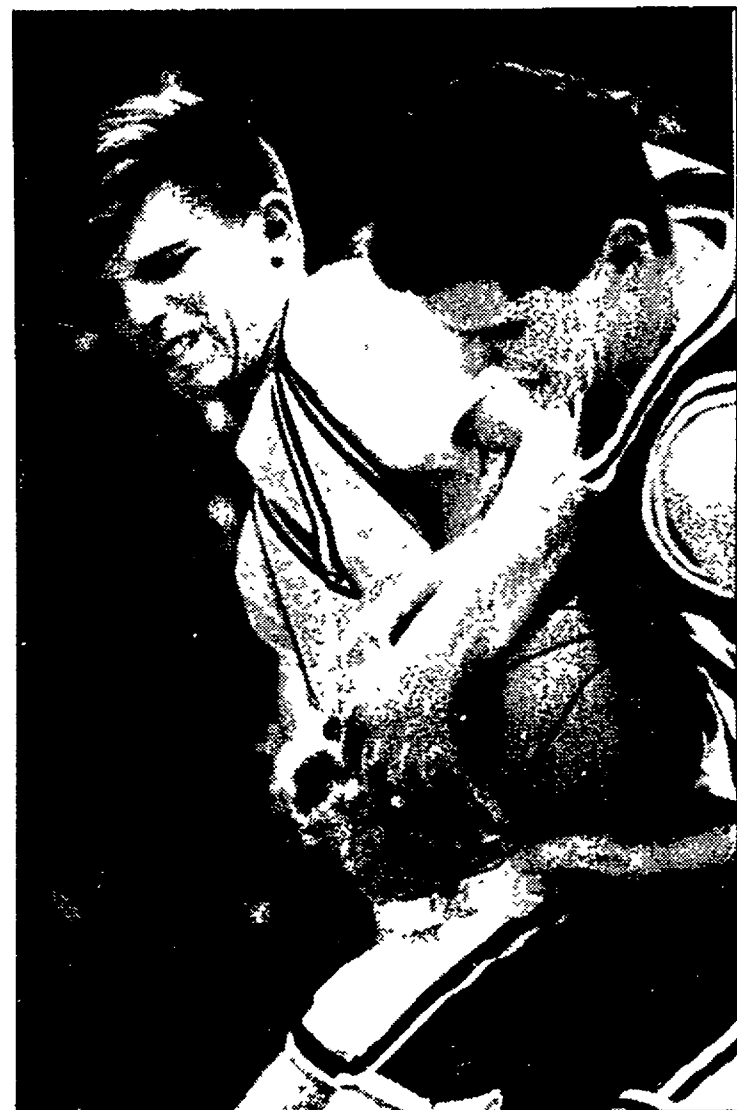

The Mustangs fought back in the fourth.

Farrar hit a short jumper in the

lane to tie the contest with 3:37 left. After a Head basket, Yackle scored to give Northville its last tie in the game. Despite the loss, Taylor was proud of his team's effort.

"We realize now when we play as a team we can play with anybody," he commented. "The kids played really good and took one of the best teams in the state to the end."

Maschek led Northville with 15 points while Farrar added 11. Head led all scorers with 24.

NFL's best meet in Hawaii

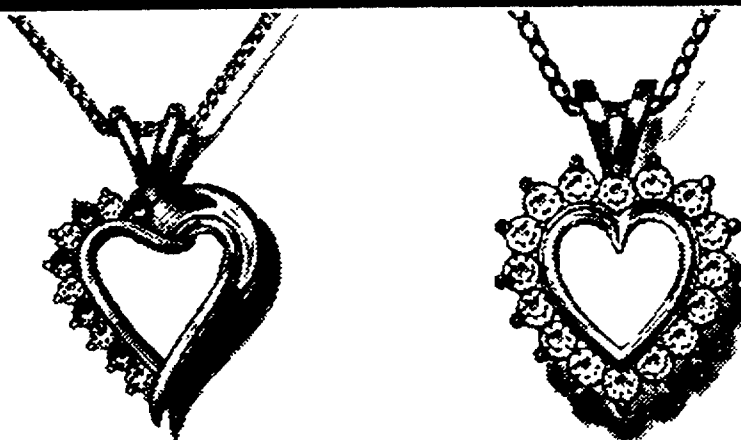

'Queen' chronicles courageous life of Haley's grandmother

Six-hour miniseries late author's last

While the *Roots* saga told the story of Alex Haley's mother's side of the family, *Queen*, the late author's final work, is his tribute to his paternal grandmother. Not a sequel to *Roots*, but rather a companion piece, the six-hour miniseries debuts Sunday, Feb. 14, on CBS, continues Tuesday, Feb. 16, and concludes Thursday, Feb. 18.

The offspring of James Jackson Jr. (Tim Daly), the master of an Alabama plantation, and Easter (Jasmine Guy), the slave woman he loves, Queen (Halle Berry) was a light-skinned slave who could pass

as white. Being a child of mixed parentage presented its own uniquely difficult set of problems and prejudices for Haley's grandmother both before and after the Civil War in the South.

"(Haley) saw Queen as representative of a vast body of dispossessed people," says scriptwriter David Stevens. "There were thousands upon thousands of these 'children of the plantation,' as they were called, and nobody had really ever spoken on their behalf."

Shunned by both blacks and whites, such children struggled in a world and time polarized along racial lines. Queen was no exception as she sought a place in the world after leaving the plantation.

"I'm taking charge of my life," Queen says. "I'm looking for my

place, where I belong."

Starring in the miniseries had special significance to Berry, herself the child of an interracial marriage.

"I realized that, had I been born 100 years ago, this could be my story," says Berry. "Queen's life could have been my life."

The original opening of *Queen* was to have been a re-creation of an experience Haley had while visiting the Forks of Cypress plantation in Florence, Ala., but Haley's death last February forced producers to make changes.

While standing at the gravesite of his white great-great grandfather, James Jackson, Sr., Haley was approached by Curtis Flowers, a white

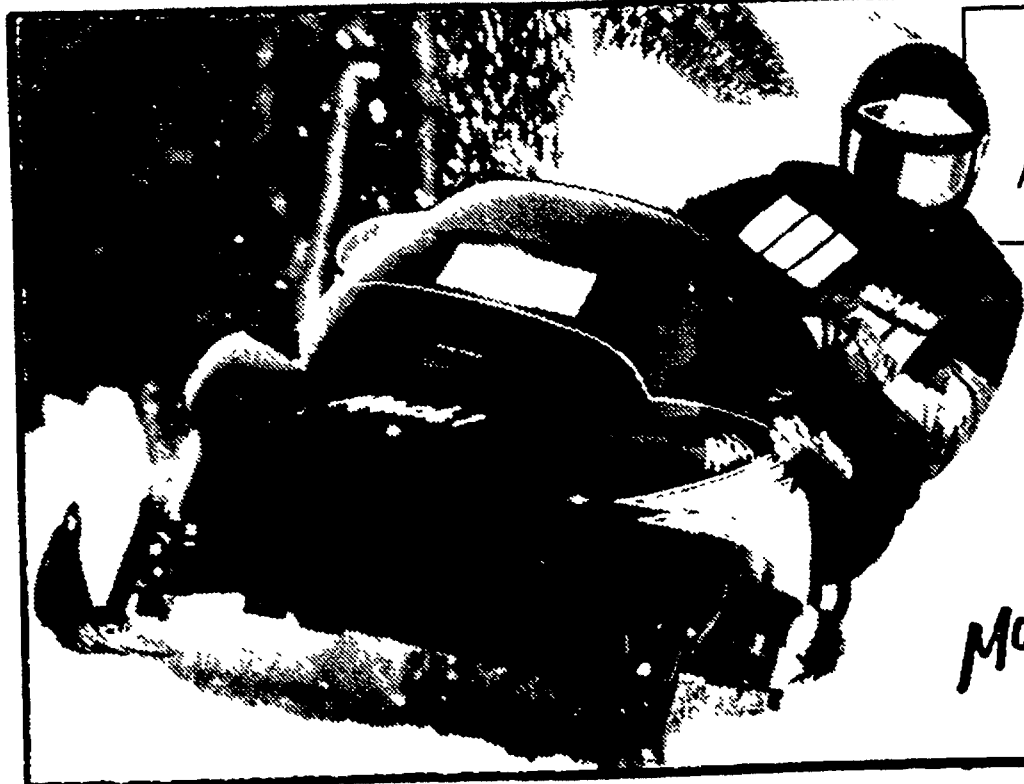

social studies teacher. Flowers was stunned to discover the two were related to the same man, but after talking, the pair became friends, and Haley was introduced to the rest of the clan. He invited his new-found relatives to his farm for the weekend, where they presented him with a stone from Jackson's tombstone and welcomed Haley to the family.

Queen features an impressive cast, including Ann-Margaret, Martin Sheen, Ossie Davis, Paul Winfield, Madge Sinclair and Danny Glover, who plays Queen's husband,

Alec, who was the father of her younger son, Simon.

"(Haley) approached me and asked me if I would play the role of his grandfather," says Glover. "As we laughed and talked about the story, I told him I would do it." Glover says Haley did only two weeks later.

One of *Queen's* important themes is the value of education, which Haley's grandmother certainly appreciated. She struggled to see that Simon had the chance to pursue his dream of getting an education.

"We got to start taking what we can get instead of just getting what we're allowed to have," Queen says

to Alec, who initially scoffs at the idea of "wasting" a son to education when he could be put to work on the farm.

Queen's persistence made Simon the first black child in Savannah, Ga., to finish grade school and eventually propelled him to graduate school at Cornell University. Her vision of education as opportunity helped produce a lawyer, an architect and a writer in the family's next generation. That writer, Alex Haley, grew up to tell her story and inspire new generations with the lessons he learned from his grandmother.

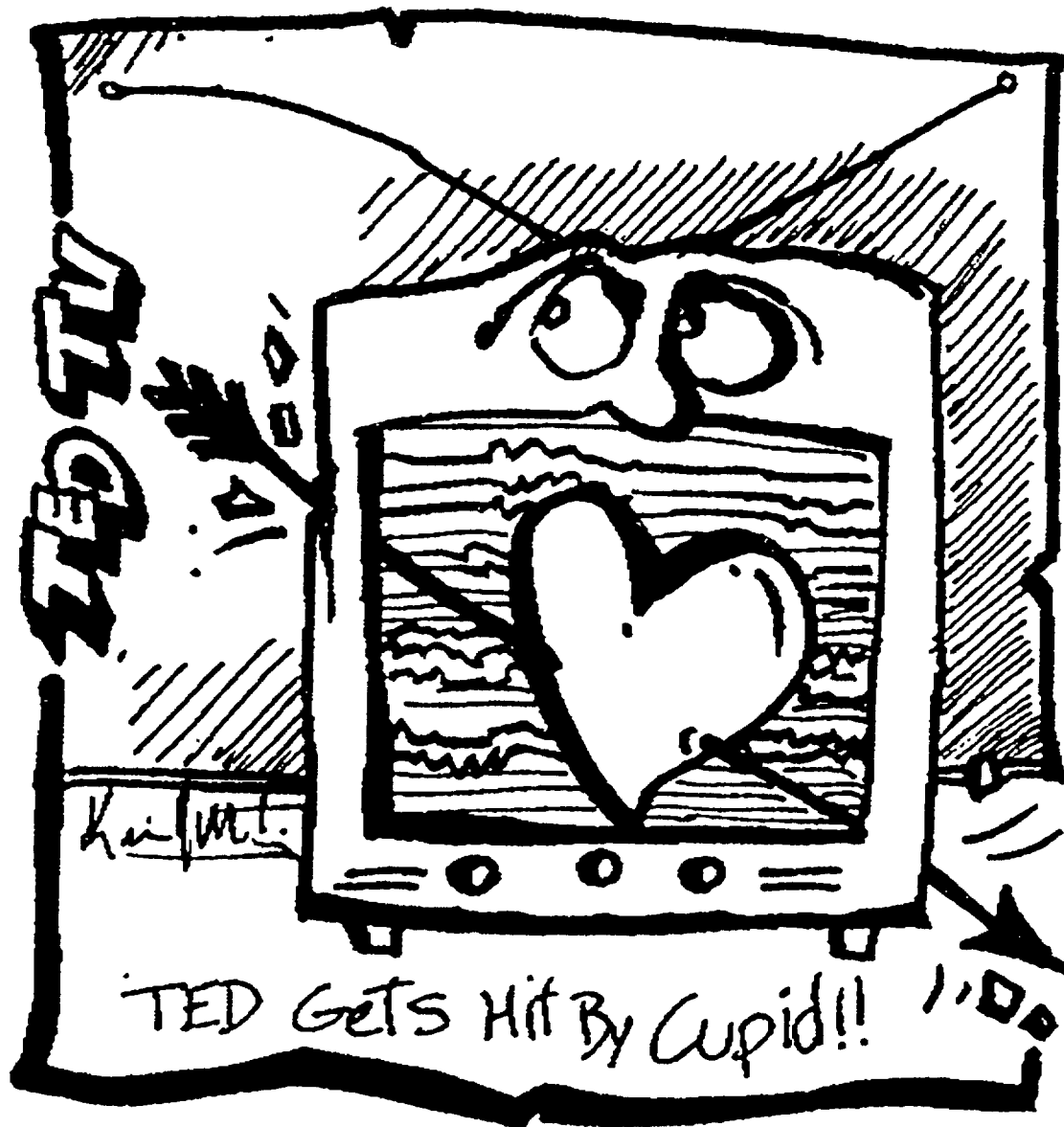

Larroquette back on NBC docket; Devane landing on ABC

John Larroquette (*Night Court*) has signed an exclusive deal with NBC to star in a new comedy series. The four-time Emmy winner will play a man recovering from a financial and emotional downfall while working as the night manager of an urban bus station. Larroquette will be the co-executive producer of the series, which is tentatively titled *Crossroads*.

Also on the rebound is William Devane, whose CBS series *Knots Landing* comes to a close in May. Devane has agreed to move to ABC to produce and star in a new series; he will also develop telefilms for the network.

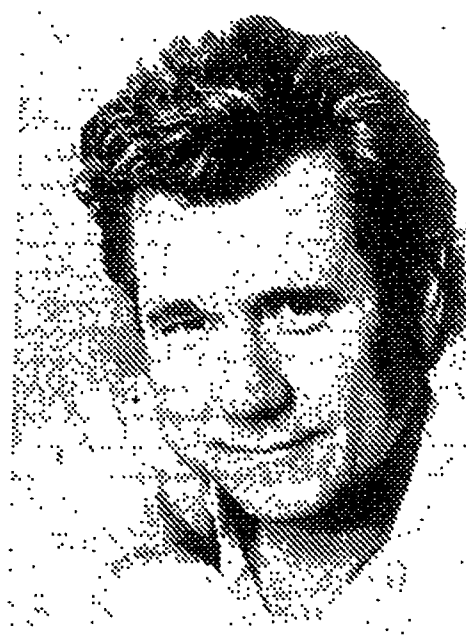
A who's who of animation greats will make up the newly formed Cartoon Network Advisory Board, scheduled to meet for the first time in May. The consultants include *Ren & Stimpy* creator John Kricfalusi, Bill Hanna and Joseph Barbera, and Noel Blanc, who is

following in the voiceprints of his father, Mel Blanc.

Ted Turner himself will be host of the Cartoon Network's upcoming "Turner Family Showcase," a quarterly series of animated adaptations of children's literature designed to foster family literacy. Titles for the series include *Charlotte's Web*, *The Phantom Tollbooth* and three adaptations of Dr. Seuss stories.

NBC has a new programming strategy up its sleeve. *Great Escapes*, scheduled to launch on Friday nights this August, is a series of six-week serialized dramas designed to offer romance, adventure and exotic locales for viewers drained by the work week. Each saga will also serve as a series pilot, in case audiences agree the escape is great indeed. The projects in development include: *Lake Success*, the tale of a family-run New York pharmaceutical empire; *Trade Winds*, in which

feuding families vie for sunken treasure in the Caribbean; and *Pretenders*, the story of a Louisiana bayou-born young woman who goes to Paris to reclaim her family's lineage.

Lansbury film a holiday favorite; Gabby rode with the Duke, Hopalong

Q: I was wondering if you could tell me the name of a Christmas movie that aired four or five years ago starring Angela Lansbury and Lee Remick. I waited to see it again, but to no avail. It's a wonderful family film. —Joyce Mathyn, West Mansfield, Ohio.

A: The name of the presentation is *The Gift of Love: A Christmas Story*, which was made for television in 1983 and replayed on CBS nearly every Christmas Day. Since you are particularly enamored of this story, perhaps you'd like to read Bess Streeter Aldrich's *The Silent Stars Go By*, on which the movie was based.

Q: I am a great fan of old Western movies. Whatever happened to character actor Gabby Hayes? —Wanda, McCook, Neb.

A: George "Gabby" Hayes was born on May 7, 1885, in Wellsville, N.Y. As a youngster, he began performing in traveling vaudeville shows. As early as 1923, he appeared in Western films, usually playing the villain. Many times in those early days it was his job to be bested by a lean, mean hero named John Wayne. When Western serials became popular in the 1930s, Hayes graduated to the part of good guy, generally playing the comically cantankerous old-timer who needed a shave and a few more teeth. In the 1950s, Hayes' work with William Boyd in the *Hopalong Cassidy* serials was rerun on television. Hayes died in 1969.

Q: Can you tell me who the kids are who sing songs and dance at the end of Beverly Hills, 90210? Sometimes they are shown interacting with the cast members, yet as far as I know, they haven't been introduced in any episodes yet. Are they going to be new cast members? —Kathi Collins, Oregon City, Ore.

A: The assorted dancers and musicians who occasionally appear with the cast members as the show is tailing off are a lucky few picked to be showcased — much in the same way dancers and rappers are introduced on *In Living Color* — by the producers. Strutting one's stuff with Luke Perry et al is a good way to gain immediate recognition in the music stores.

Q: As an admirer of John Larroquette's work on *Night Court*, I would be interested in writing to him. Do you have an address where I may contact him? —Helen Wolfe, Park Forest, Ill.

A: Larroquette, who has agreed to star in a new NBC comedy series tentatively titled *Crossroads*, may be contacted in care of Creative Artists Agency, 9830 Wilshire Blvd., Beverly Hills, Calif., 90212-1825.

Q: I'm a fan of Wallace Beery, who I believe didn't have the sort of audience and career that I think he deserved. Could you run a story on him? —Patrice Henin, Deltona, Fla.

A: Beery, whose brother, Noah, and nephew, Noah Jr., were also screen stars, probably had more of a following than you think. His career flourished in the early 1930s when Beery was one of the few stars who made the transition from silent films to talkies without much of a problem.

Born on April Fools' Day in 1885 in Kansas City, Mo., Beery performed in everything from the Ringling Bros. Circus to Broadway musicals before landing a Hollywood contract impersonating a Swedish maid in a series of 1913 comedy shorts. Work soon came more steadily, and, in 1916 he married Gloria Swanson, the first lady of cinema at the time, only to divorce her two years later. In talkies, he managed to use his throaty growl and stark appearance to forge a career that was, though not wildly flamboyant, very respectable. A list of his best work would include *Min and Bill*, *Treasure Island* (as Long John Silver), *China Seas*, *The Sea Hawk*, *Tugboat Annie*, *Dinner at Eight* and *Twenty-Mule Team*. He even won (in a tie with Fredric March) a Best Actor Oscar for 1931's *The Champ*. He died in 1949.
