Officials clash over township manager issue

Northville Township trustee Mark Abbo's successful motion to advertise for a new township manager just may have been the straw that broke the camel's back.

Abbo made the motion Thursday night to seek applicants for the job even though the board had decided two weeks ago to create a committee to study the feasibility of the job and the possibility of eliminating it altogether.

His motion passed 4-3, and triggered a shouting match between board members that sent Township Supervisor Karen Baja storming out of the board room before the meeting was adjourned.

Abbo's motion, which was supported by Trustees Russ Fogg and Barbara O'Brien and Treasurer Rick Engelland, sought to advertise for applicants for a new township manager and form a committee to review the responses. It was the same motion that failed two weeks ago without Abbo's support.

Abbo voted against the idea then but said he had since changed his mind.

"I've become convinced that a proper separation of a non-elected township manager working in conjunction with an elected supervisor and under the direction of that supervisor and this board would be a benefit to this township," he said.

He also said that while a change in the form of township government may be advantageous, he couldn't support changing the job descriptions, responsibilities or compensation for any elected official in his current term.

"I feel that the discussion before was to create a committee to study this," Abbo said. "If that committee's recommendation was to change the structure of this government by altering the duties, responsibilities and compensation or structure or status from part-time to full-time that should be debated by this board."

"However, the implementation of it should not be during the four-year term of this board. The members of the electorate should vote for it and be able to place their names on a ballot in a general election."

Baja was adamantly opposed to the motion two weeks ago when Engelland proposed it, and she was adamant again Thursday. Only this

time after the motion passed she leveled a serious complaint to her fellow board members before storming out of the room. She asked that since it was nearing 11 p.m. that Abbo's motion be tabled, but his supporters called for the question.

"I would like to, because of the late hour and the shortness of my temper anyway, at this hour of the night, to table this," she said. "To me it's 11 o'clock, it's time to stop. It's time to go home and it's time to go to bed. It certainly isn't time to discuss for another two hours another controversial issue."

But Baja's opponents on the motion didn't heed her warning. They pushed for the vote and pushed her apparently to her breaking point.

"I have never been so frustrated by a group of seven people in my entire life trying to work as a unit," she said after the motion passed. "I cannot believe the lack of respect we show one another, the underhandedness that we deal with one another, and the total game-playing that goes on with this seven member board."

"I'm disgusted to be part of it. I am highly going to consider my options over the weekend. I found this whole procedure this evening to be totally, totally offensive."

And with that she started to close the meeting. But Trustee Russ Fogg wasn't going to let her comments lie.

Twice he tried to intervene to respond to her remarks. Both times she cut him off until finally she stepped down from her chair to avoid a confrontation.

"Karen, I find your remarks insulting, personally insulting and uncalled-for," Fogg said.

To that Baja said "too bad baby, too bad." Fogg chided her more from across the room as she scrambled to leave.

"And you want to be manager, Karen? Show some maturity," he yelled to her turned back.

"I need to have mature people to deal with. So far all I have is incompetent idiots," she said in reference to her board colleagues.

With that she stormed out of the room without finishing business or adjourning the meeting.

Six stunned board members scrambled to finish the business of the meeting and close the meeting under Township Clerk Sue Hillebrand's direction.

Baja didn't report to work Friday.

Twp. chooses three new law firms

The Northville Township Board of Trustees Thursday night named three separate attorney firms to handle the township's general law, prosecution, and labor relations matters.

Following the recommendation of the attorney selection committee, the board gave the nod to three separate firms.

Detroit-based Vanderveer Garzia got the nod for general counsel. Northville's Kelly & Kelly will represent the township in 35th District court matters and Barlow & Lange was retained to handle the town-

ship's labor relations affairs.

Township Supervisor Karen Baja and Trustee Barbara O'Brien abstained from the vote to hire the firms. The board gave Baja the right to abstain after she admitted an attorney from Vanderveer Garzia had attended one of her fund-raisers and made a \$100 contribution to her campaign. O'Brien maintained her right to abstain because of what she called a possible "perceived conflict."

But even with the two board members bowing out, the remaining board members couldn't reach a consensus. Township Clerk Sue Hillebrand accepted the committee's recommendation for all three firms and turned it over to the board for ap-

proval. Trustee Mark Abbo wasn't willing to accept the plan in one sweeping motion so he asked that each hire be voted on separately.

Abbo had cited concerns about retainer costs, billing procedures, and not having ample time to review the labor relations firm as reasons for opposing the single motion. He didn't favor Vanderveer Garzia but did like Kelly & Kelly. He asked that the motion be broken down into separate motions for each law firm. Treasurer Rick Engelland backed Abbo's concern and voted against Vanderveer Garzia. But Kelly & Kelly and Barlow & Lange sailed through 5-0.

His concerns upset Hillebrand who worked on the attorney selection

committee. She also disputed Abbo's complaints that this was the first time he had seen Barlow & Lange's name. Hillebrand said that firm had answered the township's original bid proposal for an exclusive labor relations firm. The clerk was annoyed that Abbo wanted to dissect the motion and rehash the process the committee had been undergoing since November.

"I'm not trying to insult the committee," he said. "I think the committee worked hard but I think it's my job to second guess and question matters I feel are of a concern."

Abbo and Treasurer Rick Engel-

Purtell's back in schools-business partnership post

It's back in the saddle again and Jan Purtell is enjoying the ride.

Purtell was recently recalled to her position as project supervisor for the Business-Education Partnership program in Northville Public Schools. It was a post she had held for over two years beginning in 1989 before the expiration of a Department of Education grant and district cutbacks forced her lay-off.

Thanks to a \$10,000 Serve-Michigan grant, awarded to Northville Public Schools and the Northville Chamber of Commerce, Purtell is back behind her desk in the school district's central office building on West Main Street.

"It was hard being laid off because I think this is an important part of learning for the kids," she said. "It has also involved the community in a lot of ways."

Purtell said her job requires her to be a "matchmaker" of sorts by pairing the offerings of local businesses with school curriculum.

Probably one of the most successful partnership programs is the one between Amerman Elementary students and Community Federal Credit Union. Over 670 third, fourth and fifth grade students established sav-

ings goals and became members of the school's "credit union" in the 1990-91 and 1991-92 school years.

Fifth graders apply and are interviewed for teller, computer operator and branch manager positions by Community Federal's personnel manager. The credit union's head teller trains and supervises the student employees.

"The kids fill out applications, telling how responsible they are—if they feed the dog, clean their room," Purtell said. "They get dressed up in their best [for the interview]."

Throughout the year, 24 students get to work for the school's credit union. A computer terminal, provided by Community Federal, prints out receipts for students similar to those used by the financial institution.

Students can deposit anything from a penny to \$5 from 9 to 11 a.m. every other Wednesday. Last year, the three grades saved a total of \$3,000. This year, only fourth and fifth graders are eligible to become credit union members.

In return for their help, students made ornaments for the credit union's Christmas trees and the school provided the business with a partnership flag and a symbolic key to the school.

Engler plan passes Senate, stays intact

The state Senate passed a bill to cut school property taxes 20 percent last week after Sen. David Honigman was unable to strike a deal softening the blow for schools.

Honigman, a Lakes area Republican, floated a compromise plan that would have raised the property tax cut to 30 percent if voters replaced the lost school revenue by adding a penny to the sales tax.

"If I went too far one way, I couldn't get enough Republicans. If I went too far the other, no Democrats would back it," said Honigman after Wednesday's vote.

Instead the Senate passed Gov. John Engler's proposed 20 percent cut in school operating property taxes over three years. The bill contains an amendment promising to replace the lost revenue (\$1.3 billion by the third year), but it contains no funding source to fulfill the promise.

Northville Supt. Leonard Rezmierski said the amendment was better than nothing, but is still not enough.

"It's half of a loaf, if you will," he said. "They added the amendment we wanted, but there's no qualifier in the language saying how they'll recover the money. We don't know how we're

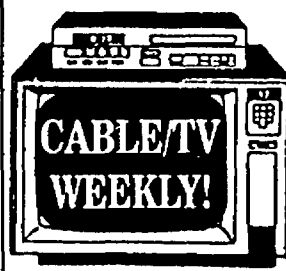

Purtell pursuing school-business links again

"We like to make sure we have those nice back-and-forth type of things," Purtell said.

Equally successful is the partnership between Old Village School and Maybury State Park. The students have built bird houses for the park and have become familiar with bird calls and identification. They also hatched pheasant eggs and released the birds when they were older. Once a week, the students visit and clean the barn and help feed the animals, too.

"This involves the students in not

only what they're learning in class, but it's also a community service approach," Purtell said. "They're giving things back to the community as well."

Winchester Elementary has a partnership with Meijer, Inc.

"One year a Meijer truck was parked in front of Winchester for a math program," Purtell said. "Kindergartners counted the lug nuts on the wheels. Fifth graders took meter sticks and figured the cubic feet in the back of the truck in a practical approach to see how much it would hold."

Other partnerships include Mor-

aine Elementary and The University of Michigan Health Center; Silver Springs Elementary and McDonald's; Cooke Middle School and NBD Bank; Meads Mill Middle School and Standard Federal Bank; Northville High School and Dow Corning Automotive Development Center; Northville High School and The Northville Record; Northville High School and Ford Motor Company; Math-Science Resource Center and The Society of Automotive Engineers; Math-Science Resource Center and Maybury State Park; Early Childhood Development Center and Senior Citizens Center; and Educational Technology Resource Center and Nissan Research and Develop-

ment, Inc.

The Serve-Michigan grant, which was also awarded to 63 other Michigan school districts, allows Purtell to work 15 hours per week strengthening Northville's partnership program and helping other districts either establish or continue partnership programs of their own. By Wednesday, Purtell has usually already put in about 18 hours.

"Hopefully in the future we'll have more hours," Purtell said.

An advisory council composed of business people, parents, teachers, one student and school administra-

tion meet regularly to oversee the partnership programs. Purtell said she's always looking for more businesses to join.

"A lot of people think I'm just a small business and I don't have anything to offer," or "I'm so busy right now, it would be hard to fit anything else in," she said.

Not true, according to Purtell. A local gemologist spent one morning with students demonstrating different gemstones using a microscope which projected its view onto a television screen.

"It was nice because the kids could see what the gemologist was showing all at once rather than crowding around," she said. "He showed them all

their birthstones and where different gems were found. It was only one morning, but it was really important to the kids."

Purtell added that she knew it was difficult for businesses in a tough economy, but said it was a "double sword" because teachers are having difficulty scheduling activities due to large class sizes.

"I don't want to say all of our partnerships are successful," she said. "Sometimes it doesn't always happen the way I think it should or when it should."

Drug problem, solutions are topics at task force meeting

Local residents cited dozens of factors that might contribute to Northville's drug problem at a Wednesday task force meeting.

Fortunately, potential solutions were nearly as easy to itemize.

The landmark meeting, led off by keynote addresses from Mayor Chris Johnson and Township Supervisor Karen Baja, drew more than 70 residents to the Genitt's Samuel H. Little Theater on Main Street.

The attendees included scout leaders, church representatives, school officials including Supt. Leonard Reznierski, Township Police Chief Chip Snider, Northville Regional Hospital Director Dr. Walter Brown, and many who simply identified themselves as concerned parents and residents. A dozen high school students sat in as well.

The meeting was coordinated by John Farrar of the Community Commission of Drug Abuse (CCODA), an umbrella organization that includes the Northville, Livonia and Westland counseling centers.

"We're hopeful that this is going to bring some new ideas and new awareness to the community," said CCODA Prevention Coordinator Jacques Martin-Downs.

The task force formation follows the release of an Alcohol and Other Drugs School Survey last September in which more Northville High School seniors said they drank alcohol and used drugs than their counterparts across the country.

In the survey, 42 percent of local seniors said they had used illicit drugs as opposed to 35 percent nationwide, and 69 percent of the seniors said they had used alcohol within the last month. That figure was 12 percent higher than the national average.

The task force participants filled six sheets of paper with potential reasons for Northville's drug problem. The reasons included poor communication between schools and the home and between parents themselves, peer pressure, and the lack of recreational alternatives for Northville's youth.

"Parents don't believe that alcohol is that much of a problem," said one woman. Chief Snider pointed to the "availability of the substance and availability of money to get it."

Northville Action Council member Roxanne Casterline cited "a lack of knowledge as to what programs exist and a lack of support for the programs that do exist."

Those resources include programs like NAC, Northville Youth Assistance, Charles Stule's Student Assistance Program at Northville High

School, substance abuse prevention lessons in the Michigan Model for Comprehensive Health, local churches, and drug treatment programs at Northville Regional.

Once the residents had compiled their problem and resource lists, they broke into smaller groups and adjourned to Genitt's Hole-in-the-Wall Restaurant to brainstorm potential awareness and prevention activities. The 34 resulting ideas ranged from establishing a youth club or teen center, to establishing a youth coordinator and setting up parent workshops.

The list will be sent to all task force participants, who have been asked to rank their 10 favorite ideas and forward them to CCODA.

Those 10 suggestions will then be distributed to the community for priority ranking, and committees will then be set up to implement the top three.

National school officials to pay visit

The Northville Public Schools' technology system has drawn some national attention.

On April 27 and 28, members of the National School Boards Association (NSBA) will tour the schools to have a look at the system.

"They (NSBA members) were very impressed with the process we use of integrating technology into our curriculum," said William Hamilton, director of instructional services. "They would like to share it with school districts around the country."

Every classroom and office in every school of the Northville district has been wired for voice, data and two-way interactive voice and audio. With computers in every classroom, teachers and students can also transmit and receive data between buildings and classrooms. According

to a memo from Hamilton, the infrastructure for telephone communications is in place and will allow the district to put a phone in each teacher's classroom. Like the current technology, the telephone conferencing will be transmitted through the district-owned fiber optic network.

Northville's technology program has taken approximately two years to complete.

The NSBA learned about Northville's technology system through the Wayne County Regional Educational Service Agency.

"They tend to be more aware of the national type of things occurring," Hamilton said. "They knew the NSBA was looking for districts around the country that were implementing technology into their curriculum."

Hamilton said Wayne County made the initial suggestion for NSBA members to visit Northville.

"We certainly were excited about it," Hamilton said of the district's reaction when it learned about the visit. "It validated for us that these people who have seen technology throughout the country thought ours stood out."

Hamilton said the K-12 Technology Committee will be an integral part of the planning for the visit. The program will begin with a 7 p.m. dinner April 27 sponsored by Northville vendors after NSBA members register at the Novi Hilton.

A full day of activities are scheduled for April 28 with a tour of elementary, middle and high schools at 8 a.m. in Northville. Participants will view the district's multimedia projects, interactive video and audio, electronic media centers and integration of technology into the K-12 curriculum.

Following lunch sponsored by the

Wayne County Regional Educational Service Agency, a breakout session will be held with Northville vendors and educators followed by question-and-answer sessions with technical experts, educators and representatives of: Computer Education Services, Elan Engineering, IBM, Lansing Telecommunications, Merit, Microsoft, Northville Public Schools, Novell and the Wayne County Regional Educational Service Agency.

After one additional breakout session between 2:15 and 3:15 p.m., NSBA members will travel to the West Ottawa School District in Holland, Mich., to view its technology program.

"Normally, I think the NSBA usually picks one (district) to visit," Hamilton said. "But because they found two districts in Michigan that are close in proximity, maybe they thought they could have two for the price of one."



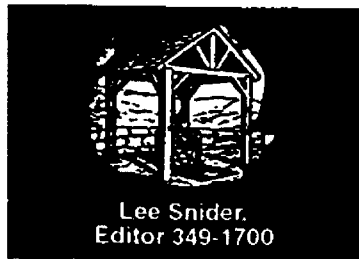

Baja shows she can't handle full-time post

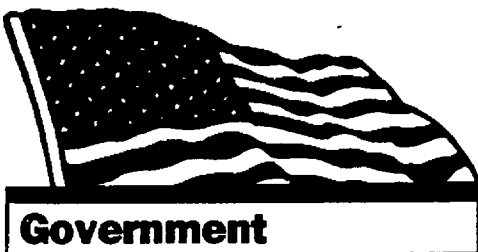
Thursday night the Northville Township Board of Trustees voted to begin accepting applications for the position of township manager, a post that has been vacant since the board decided late last year not to renew the contract of former manager Richard Henningsen.

The board's 4-3 vote was unexpected, since only two weeks ago township officials established a committee to explore the possible overhaul of the current township government system.

The decision to accept resumes outgoing Supervisor Karen Baja, whose preference for converting the supervisor's position from a part-time to a full-time post is the worst kept secret in town. Following passage, Baja pushed her chair back, stood up behind the board table and told her fellow officials in no uncertain terms that she was through trying to get anything done.

Declaring herself frustrated by her disrespectful, disagreeable colleagues, she proclaimed in public that she was not going to take it anymore, that the job just wasn't worth it. She then walked out of the board room before the meeting was adjourned, leaving trustees and audience members with mouths wide open in disbelief. As of this writing, Baja was reportedly thinking about whether she was going to stay on or make good on her implied threat to resign the position to which she was elected only four months ago.

We will, for now at least, leave the question of resignation up to Baja. She is still the best person to judge whether she can fulfill her duties as supervisor in an effective, competent manner. However, we have no reservations whatsoever about stating our belief that Baja is not temperamentally cut out to handle the role of full-time supervisor. It is quite clear to us that, while she may be intellectually capable, Baja is not emotionally mature enough to endure the rigors of full-time office. Her behavior at times has suggested that her thinking and judgment have been affected by the

stresses of her difficult position and her outburst Thursday night has only served to reinforce this view of her.

It is our opinion that the whole matter of looking at possibly restructuring the leadership ranks of government in Northville Township ought to be dropped outright at this time. The idea of doing away with the township manager and making the supervisor's position full-time was handled poorly from the start and was the brain child of Clerk Sue Hillbrand, who, along with Baja, obviously favors upgrading the supervisor to full-time status. Baja was not elected as a full-time supervisor, and for her to begin angling for the job only a few months after being elected is at least arrogant and at best tacky.

Northville Township should continue to use the part-time supervisor/full-time manager form of government. Employing a permanent manager who is not subject to defeat at the polls can ensure continuity through changes in administrations. Moreover, a highly precise job description can be written for the position, ensuring that a thorough search will lead to the naming of a qualified professional to fill the post.

Now that the board has voted to begin accepting applications for a full-time manager, we believe the time is right to disband the ad hoc committee that was appointed to look at revamping the government of the township and get on with the business of searching in earnest for a replacement for Richard Henningsen.

As for Baja, we suggest she cut her losses and try to make a fresh start.

Problems, solutions listed by task force

Wednesday's landmark meeting of a new "Community Task Force on Alcohol and Drugs" went a long way toward delineating the challenges facing Northville in the struggle to lessen its dependence on drugs.

Northville's youth were chided for succumbing to peer pressure, and parents were chastized for denying that a problem exists and for taking too few steps to solve it. The schools were criticized for poor communication with parents, and the community's many existing drug awareness and prevention programs were censured for acting on their own instead of in concert.

There is probably an element of truth to all the criticism, but fortunately the task force members resisted the temptation to stop at finger-pointing and went on to discuss potential solutions as well.

The resulting 34 "awareness and prevention activities" focused principally on student programs, but also included establishing parent workshops, publishing a Prevention Network Newsletter for all parents, and involving churches more directly in the process.

Students themselves made the valid point that Northville has relatively few recreational activities geared toward

teenage youth, and the proposed activities included enhancing the activities available through Northville Parks and Recreation to designing a skateboard area and establishing a youth club or teen center. That last idea in particular has been bandied about by various agencies for years, but little progress has been made.

Perhaps now, with the entire community focused on the problem, such ideas will get more attention than they have to this point.

Mayor Chris Johnson noted last week that when a problem is identified in Northville, the community does rally together to find a solution. The impressive turnout for Wednesday's task force demonstrated that fact, as did the willingness of participants to set aside their differences and seek a common goal.

Now the task force must focus its efforts on the implementation of specific programs. That step will follow feedback from the participants and a community-wide survey to narrow the list of 34 activities down to three.

So far, it appears that the alarm sounded last September by the release of the Alcohol and Other Drug School Survey is being answered, and Northville has begun responding to the call.

Education drives home a point



In this office, we get literally hundreds of pieces of mail a week. Unfortunately, I'd say that about 80 percent of them are useless to us. Sound anything like the mail you get at home?

Recently, however, in a pile of press releases about vacation opportunities in Flint and real estate values in Toledo I found a nugget of information that I shanghaied on its way to the circular file.

It was a copy of the newsletter for the Traffic Safety Association of Michigan, a non-profit educational group that monitors traffic safety.

At the top of the report was a statement by the Michigan State Police that, though figures are still "provisional," traffic fatalities in Michigan in 1992 were "likely to be considerably less than in 1991 when 1,425 persons died."

The newsletter indicated that the final figure, once all reports are filed, is expected to be right around 1,300, close to the all-time record low (except for 1943) of 1,331 set in 1983.

Major reductions are expected in injuries as well. In evidence of that point, the MSP "Quick Facts" noted that from January through November of 1992 (11-month figures) there were just 88,931 vehicular injuries, compared to 122,800. That's about a 30-percent reduction, which is huge.

You might attribute the plummeting numbers of deaths and injuries to safer cars. Things like air bags, anti-lock brakes, and better "crash survivability" of body and frame designs likely help. People are also better at observing the seat belt law, you might say.

Yet, as much as deaths and injuries are down, the total number of crashes was down in 1992 as well. In the 11 months through November of 1992, there were 255,608 crashes in Michigan, compared to 323,712 for the same period in 1991. Again, an almost 30-percent reduction.

From 1983 through 1989, crash totals had actually been on the increase. But the downward turns in 1990 and 1991 were nothing like last year's.

So why is this happening? Are Michiganders driving less? Nope. Fatalities per 100 million miles traveled are 1.50 for 1992, an all-time record low.

Could it be the crackdown on drunk driving? Now you're getting warmer. There's evidence that there is some deterrent effect as a result of tougher laws, but that's only part of the picture. That wouldn't explain why sober drivers have fewer accidents too.

Here's the real kicker. The Michigan State Police reports that its total enforcement activity is down significantly from 1992 to 1991 as well. Though it doesn't include figures from county sheriffs and local police, the MSP reports that "arrests for speeding, drunk driving and other hazardous violations were all down in 1992."

The compelling conclusion is that we in Michigan are simply driving better. (Hard to believe, I know, if you've ever ridden with me.)

There can be just one reason why this is happening, and that is education. Campaigns by MADD, SADD and any other group you care to mention are keeping drunks, our biggest accident risks, off the roads. Driver's education programs are also turning out better new drivers.

The next time someone suggests that a major societal problem — drugs, crime, unplanned pregnancies — can be solved with education and PR blitzes, you might want to listen. Michigan's improving driving record shows that the system works.

Well, OK maybe the system doesn't quite work. After all, if Michigan is driving better, you'd think our auto insurance rates would be going down at a similar rate. That, however, is another column.

Nobody wanted the stadium



Somehow I kept thinking about the Novi City Council and the rumors that Tom Monaghan wanted to move the Detroit Tigers to a suburban location when I attended the Spring Home and Garden Show at the Novi Expo Center last weekend.

One of the things I liked best about the show, for those of you who did not attend, was the fact that several local merchants were represented.

Jim Cowie was there from Ann's Fabrics in Northville, Paul Bauman from Reid Lighting in Novi had a booth and so did John Zawadzki from Tiffany Glass in Northville.

Cowie even spent a stint on center stage, pitching his special process for decorating walls. Looking and sounding a lot more like a veteran pitcher than the former college professor he is.

But I get away from my story, i.e. the Novi City Council and discussion about moving Tiger Stadium out of Detroit and into the suburbs.

Shortly after Monaghan started talking about moving the Tigers to the suburbs, the Novi City Council passed a resolution which said, in effect, that the Tigers should stay right where they are . . . that the Tigers belong in Detroit . . . and Novi wouldn't accept the Tigers even if there was a proposal to build a new stadium out this way.

The TV guys ate it up, brought their cameras out to Novi to take pictures of the council members passing the resolution while wearing Tiger baseball caps. But then you would expect that kind of reaction from the television news types. (The NBC flasco over the rigged GM truck tests only strengthens my contention that "television news" is the ultimate oxymoron.) This paper took a different position, criticizing the council

for grandstanding for the television cameras. After all, nobody had ever suggested that a new Tiger stadium would be built in Novi or Northville.

I thought that editorial was okay, but I couldn't get all that worked up about the council's "grandstanding" either.

Frankly, I thought the resolution was sort of cute. The fact of the matter was that the council didn't want the dam stadium and all the problems that would come with it. Not only did they not want it, they would have opposed strongly any plans to move it out here.

But the ironic little twist I thought was cute was that the resolution made it sound like the council was standing up for the preservation of downtown Detroit, when, in fact, Novi has been one of the prime beneficiaries of suburban flight from the core city. There's a Hudson's in Novi; none in Detroit.

But an exposition center is a different matter. Keep your baseball stadium, Detroit, but about that exposition center . . . it would fit nicely into plans for the Regional Center Area, that property surrounding the Novi Road/I-96 interchange which already includes three major retail centers and several hotels and restaurants.

My guess is that the Novi Expo Center has a good chance of making it. Blair Bowman, president of the center, has some major problems to resolve. Access and parking are bad, bad, bad. But, they are problems which can be resolved.

The reason the expo center has a good shot at making it is that it's a heck of a lot more convenient for most of us north-west suburbanites to go to Novi than it is to downtown Detroit.

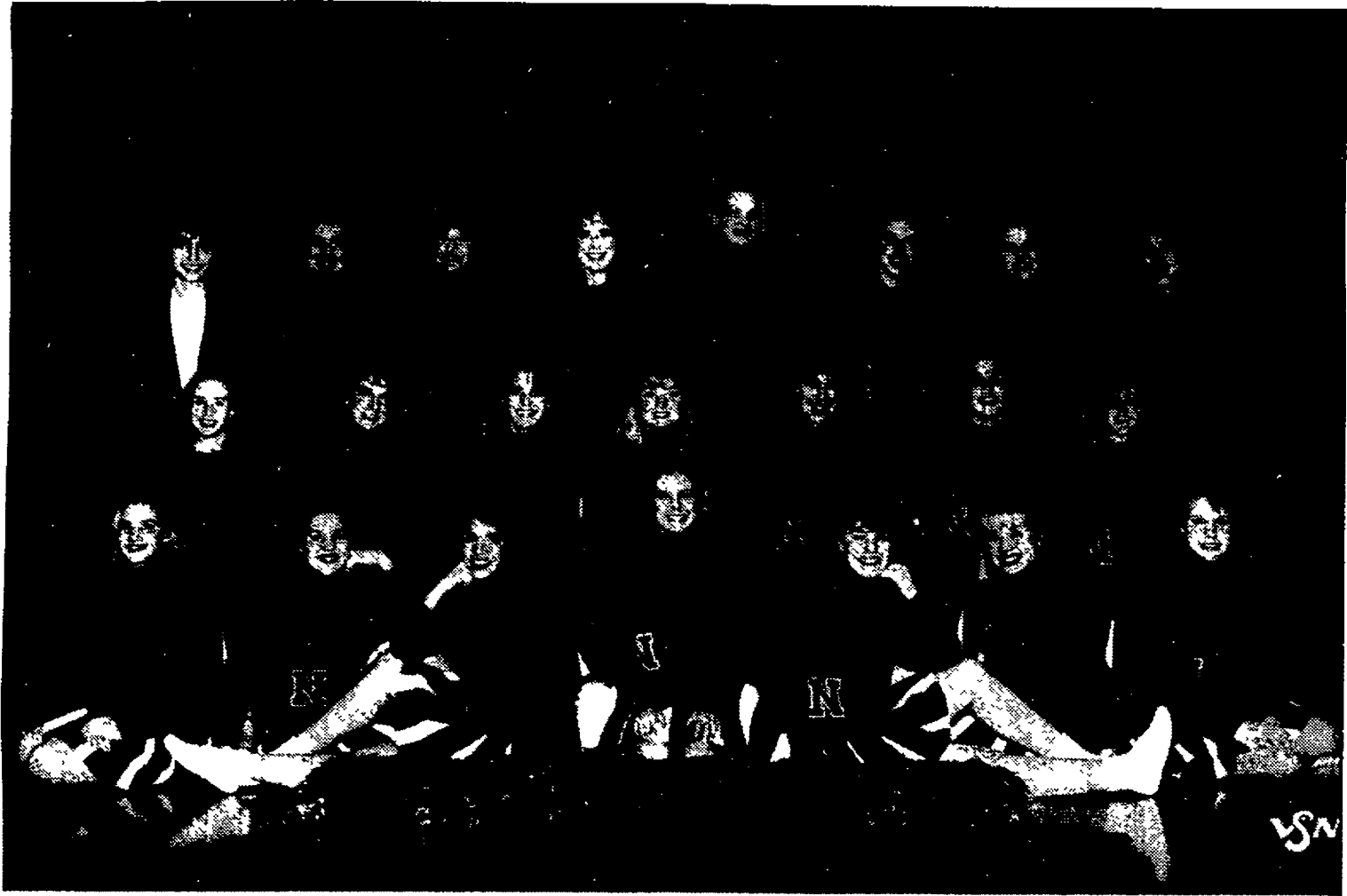

NHS pom-pon team heads to state finals

It takes more than a smiling face, however, to be a good pom pon team member. According to Warner, a successful team member must be dedicated, willing to work hard, have some dancing ability, good memorization skills, be a team player and have excellent communication skills.

People shouldn't confuse pom pon squads with cheerleaders because the two are totally different activities, Warner said.

"They're different because cheerleaders cheer through events," she said. "Pom pon is strictly a half-time performance and is strictly with music."

Gov's tax plan is over one hurdle

going to make up that revenue."

Nineteen Republicans voted yes on Senate Bill 146. All 16 Democrats, joined by Republican Fred Dillingham of Fowlerville, voted no.

Dillingham predicted the bill would fail in the House of Representatives, which will take up the bill this week. "You're creating further gridlock down the road," he warned his party.

But the promise in the amendment looked good to Sen. Robert Geake, R-Northville, whose home base has five out-of-formula school districts — including the Northville school district — that would be hard-hit by a property tax cut.

"Once the amendment was added, I voted for the bill," he told 75 constituents who had written or called to protest it. Geake said the protests appeared to have been orchestrated by Livonia school officials, who said they stood to lose one-fourth of their \$100 million budget.

But it looked bad to Sen. Jack Faxon, D-Farmington Hills, whose district includes Novi. "We are promising some relief at the expense of many school districts," said Faxon. "I don't think it's realistic to expect the teachers to negotiate 20 percent reductions in pay or expect Consumers Power to negotiate a 20 percent reduction in utilities."

In-formula districts (the 70 percent receiving state aid) would have much of their lost local taxes repaid by the state aid formula. But out-of-formula districts would take a straight loss.

Honigman's failed deal called for: ■ Passing Engler's 20 percent cut in school operating taxes (achieved by paring assessments from 50 percent to 40 percent of market value over three years).

■ Placing a sales tax hike on the August ballot. If voters raised the tax from four cents to five, the money would be used to reimburse schools' lost revenue at \$545 per pupil. Out-of-formula districts would be guaranteed state payment of their retirement costs and no cuts in their "categorical" aid (for buses and special education). Moreover, taxpayers would get a 30 percent cut in school property taxes, instead of the 20 percent offered by Engler.

If voters were to say no, the 20 percent cut, with no reimbursements, would take effect.

"It never got voted on," said Honig-

man, whose western Oakland district includes homes with soaring assessments and out-of-formula schools.

"The Democrats wouldn't go with that. The Democrats wanted the sales tax in place before the property tax cut," he said.

Democrat Faxon agreed. "We said it (sales tax) had to be in place (before the property tax cut). We offered three senators to negotiate."

After the deal collapsed, Honigman and others won support for the amendment by which the state promised to replace lost revenue.

That promise was worthless, in Faxon's view. "It says 'we shall do this.' If the money's not there, you can't do it. You can't force the Legislature to appropriate money. It's like have a bank account with no money," Faxon said.

SB 146 is narrowly drawn to apply only to K-12 school taxes, not city, township, county, community college, library or metropark taxes.

Senate Republicans pushed the bill through in a single day, bypassing the normal procedure of discussing it on "general orders" on day and passing it the second.

Faxon protested: "To put this bill on a fast track serves no one."

Dillingham said his GOP caucus used speed "to meet a political end, not a policy end."










Senate Republicans said they pushed the bill so that the House could take it up in February, when Republican Willis Bullard Jr. of Milford chairs the Taxation Committee. Bullard's district includes the City of Novi. In March the committee will be chaired by Democrat Lyn Jondahl of Okemos, who is unlikely to take it up.

Gov. Engler applauded the Senate action.

"This plan will cut taxes, create jobs and keep Michigan's economy moving in the fast lane," he said. Engler argues that a net tax cut — not a shift — is needed to make Michigan's business climate competitive with neighboring states.

A Democratic gubernatorial hopeful, Sen. Debbie Stabenow of Lansing, said Republicans should have learned a lesson last November when Michigan voters rejected Engler's Proposal C (Cut & Cap) because it "devastates schools."


House Speaker Curtis Hertel, D-Detroit, denounced the reimbursement promise as "a sham," adding that "children clearly are going to be hurt."

*Glasses raised
for rose-colored
bottle of bubbly*

Rose (pronounced row-zay) or pink champagne are not new. The House of Veuve Clicquot is historically acknowledged as the first to have produced a pink champagne in 1777. In the past, the popularity of pink champagne has ebbed and flowed with each generation. Recently, this has not proven true. It's in to stay.

Pink champagne is in vogue, as much for its distinctive color as for its superior match with food. Colors range from pale onion skin to salmon or copper color, and on to cherry red. This bubbly is fruity, with more robust flavors and more tannin than golden bottlings, and works well with appetizers, hearty entrees, fruit desserts and rich, tangy cheeses.

The major portion of rose champagne is consumed by the French and the English. Roughly 3 to 4 percent of all champagne imports to the United States are rose. Although quantities are small, virtually every well-known champagne house has one, and many have two. Some houses produce rose champagne only in vintage years.

In an earlier time, the pink color became associated with frivolity and even a symbol of wild and dissolute living.

According to one legend, rose champagne was created for an important wedding when the bride requested a wine to match the satin slippers and long dresses chosen for her bridesmaids. Another popular version relates that pink champagne was blended to honor the coronation of a young queen. It was loved by the Victorians and Edwardians. In the 19th century, pink champagne was commonly called *oeil de perdrix* (eye of the partridge) for its distinctive color, distinguishing it from its golden-colored relative.

Most likely, pink champagne was an accident of nature during an unusually sunny and warm growing season in the champagne district. That year, the red champagne grapes, pinot noir and pinot meunier, had darker pigmentation. During pressing, this color entered the juice and a pink tinge resulted in the wine.

Rose champagne is difficult to produce. By French law, three methods are permitted, two of them risky and require skillful winemaking practices.

The older, more difficult method, allows the skins of pinot noir grapes to remain in contact with the juice after pressing. The second method employs the addition of still red pinot noir wine from the village of Bouzy of Ambonnay to the blend prior to the second fermentation in the bottle.

The third and least desirable practice in terms of a lasting pink color, adds a small amount of red pinot noir wine to the bottle before it is corked.

Because color results are unpredictable, producers make rose champagne less frequently than they do golden bottlings. Since quantities are limited and greater production care is required, rose champagne is more expensive than the golden. You can expect to pay between \$40 and \$95 for these special bottlings.

Always serve champagne well chilled. Place the bottle in a bucket filled with half ice and half cold water for about 30 minutes.

Use caution when opening the bottle. Remove the wire cage with the bottle facing away from you. Using a towel, slowly rotate the bottle

Mackinnon, locals serve Town Meeting feast

Some people have it as their life's goal to meet a president.

To prepare dinner for one would be beyond their wildest dreams. But when President Bill Clinton came to Detroit last week for his nationally televised Town Meeting, the one preparing dinner for the gathered VIPs was Tom MacKinnon, chef/owner of MacKinnon's Restaurant in Northville.

While the president fielded questions from a live audience at WXYZ-TV studios in Southfield, about 100 dignitaries gathered in an adjacent room to watch the event. The room was filled with heavy hitters from Michigan and the Detroit area: U.S. Sens. Carl Levin and Don Riegle, Congressmen Sander Levin and John Dingell, former Gov. James Blanchard, Detroit Mayor Coleman Young, Detroit Police Chief Stanley Knox, Attorney General Frank Kelley, Secretary of State Richard Austin, a host of judges and chairmen of companies like Stroh's, Art Van, K mart, Ford and General Motors.

"This has been the biggest night of my life," said MacKinnon as he reclined in a chair after the event. That's quite a statement coming from a man who toured with Paul McCartney and the Wings in 1976, and has served meals for numerous Detroit celebrities.

It was on the recommendation of the general manager for Channel 7, who frequents MacKinnon's Restaurant, that MacKinnon got the call to prepare dinner for the presidential party. MacKinnon made no secret of the fact that he tried to emphasize Michigan elements in his meal.

Gracing the buffet table were freshwater favorites like salmon cakes, salmon and spinach terrine, and smoked trout and mushroom terrine. Mini Michigan meat pies with dried cherries were also on the menu. Michigan's famous morel mushrooms turned up in violin-shaped puff pastry wrapping. In maintaining the musical theme, there were miniature saxophones as a tribute to Clinton.

"The saxophones are done in puff pastry, and the keys are sliced peppercorns," said MacKinnon. "My bartender helped me with that."

MacKinnon also indulged his own fancy for game meats with a confit of duck in whole wheat phyllo pastry, and apple stuffed mallard breasts.

"I get all my game same-day fresh from a place in Chicago," MacKinnon said. "It's very high quality."

Another big favorite that kept the crowd coming back for more was the miniature beef Wellington, with sauce Bordelaise.

MacKinnon wasn't alone in service to his country. Master Chef Dan Hugelier, who teaches ice carving (among other things) at Schoolcraft College, carved an American bald eagle out of ice to serve as a centerpiece for the buffet line.

Vassel's catering of Southfield ran the bar, which was stocked with Stroh's beer, and Old Detroit beer from Frankenmuth Breweries. Michigan wines were showcased as well. Leelanau Wine Cellars, Premier Cellars Winery, Tabor Hill and Bowers Harbor supplied some of their most popular bottles. St. Julian's non-alcoholic sparkling wines also proved popular.

There were a couple of ringers behind the bar, though. There was one bottle each of a white Chateau Clinton and a red Clos de Clinton, which were actually a relabeled California chardonnay and a French red table wine.

MacKinnon also got a big assist from Jim Ankofski and his staff at the Pastry Palace in Novi.

"We do quite a bit of work with Tom MacKinnon," said Karen Ankofski, Jim's sister. "We help on some of his big jobs, like for Bob Seeger and some of the newscasters' weddings."

The Ankofskis supplied a variety of small pastries — petit fours, mini canolis, swan-shaped cream puffs. But the highlight was a 16-inch torte with the Presidential Seal on top. Jim himself worked overnight Tuesday to create it.

Other local merchants chipped in too. Crawford's Bakery Connection in Northville dealt up some Michigan-shaped biscuits. Country Epicure of Novlet some of its home-baked cornbread, which was in the shape of an ear of corn. Grunwald's House of Fudge in Plymouth contributed huge slabs of fudge, and scrumptious chocolate-covered potato chips. Even McDonald Ford of Northville played a role. They gave MacKinnon a deal on a rented truck to transport all the items.

But MacKinnon had more in mind than just serving a meal. When Clinton arrived in the VIP suite, MacKinnon was one of the first people he greeted.

"He always goes and talks to the workers first," MacKinnon said.

MacKinnon seized the opportunity to take Clinton up

on a statement the president made more than once during the Town Meeting: "If you've got any ideas I'd like to hear them."

Shaking Clinton's hand, MacKinnon handed him a folded up flyer which described two of the community service projects MacKinnon is involved with. MacKinnon and Computer Training and Support Corp. of Livonia have teamed up in a pilot project that provides alternative sentencing programs through the Department of Corrections, the City of Detroit and Detroit Public Schools. Convicts are offered culinary arts employment as part of their rehabilitation.

MacKinnon and CTSC also are teaming up to open a culinary arts program, and a food preparation and food distribution center which will serve and train the homeless in Detroit. This will be a collaborative effort with Mother Waffles, the City of Detroit and the Ford Foundation.

"It is our intent to use culinary arts as part of an overall program to provide employment opportunities to those in need," the flyer says.

"I handed him a couple of flyers and said, 'Mr. President, some ideas for you,'" MacKinnon said. "He took them and handed them to an aide and told him, 'Take these, and we'll read them on the plane.' And he said it like he meant it."

"He really connects with people."

Family brings reminiscences of former meals



In six days my grandmother will be 91.

I have been so lucky. Until my late teens all of my grandparents were alive and healthy. Thankfully, none of them suffered, and they passed away fairly quietly. Old age was the culprit. The bodies went, but the minds were strong to the end.

Each of them taught me valuable life lessons. My mom's parents, Elizabeth and

Tom Edick, raised 10 children. And this during the Depression. Talk about crazy ... I can't imagine feeding 12 mouths during a time when food was scarce. But both were great cooks and could make do with a minimal selection.

Those were the days when bacon fat was saved and used instead of oil for frying. A stock bucket was kept for onion peels, elery ends, carrot scraps and meat trimmings. Throw in a good bone or two and voila, soup for a few meals.

To this day I can remember with relish their soups. A bit of bread, some butter, a big kitchen table and lots of people. Always, a houseful. Most of the time you would be handed a quart to take home.

The Edicks were inherently superb cooks. A touch of lemon juice to bring out

flavor, a dash of tabasco. And don't forget that the most important part of the soup is brown bones. Most significantly, their home was a meeting place for brothers and sisters and their families, my cousins. All were welcome, and the more the merrier.

And it wasn't pot luck. They handled all the cooking. More than an adoration for simple, hearty foods was learned in this abode. Life-long ties started here and continue years later.

My father's parents were on the opposite end of the spectrum. My grandfather, Alfred, married Isabelle when she was in her early 20s and he, his early 40s. They had two children. Grandfather was a fine educator, loved to study and speak French, wrote beautiful letters, worked with masonry, and was a lifelong army

man. He retired as a colonel and served in two world wars and each summer in the reserves.

He also loved my grandmother's cooking. In this family too, food was a big part of our gatherings. Grandmother was a registered nurse and worked in a doctor's office for years. As children, we got our shots and medicines from her with tender care. I would spend many of my weekends at their home.

It was here that I learned the proper setting of a table for elegant meals. I ate three squares a day and grandfather and I looked forward to each one anxiously. The time in between was spent reading and visiting. A Vernon's float or hot fudge sundae sent us off to bed.

When my father was transferred to De-

troit, it broke my grandpa's hear. His seven grandchildren kept him young and active. It was very lonely for him to have us leave. We looked forward to their visits at Christmas and Easter. And then, it was too hard to travel.

On Sunday my dad and I will drive to Buffalo to celebrate the birthday of his mother and my grandmother. Already, we are talking about what food we'll treat ourselves to. The french fries from the stand in Brantford, Ontario, and the lean Canadian bacon sliced thick for breakfast. I'm sure Aunt Betty (mom's sister) will have a few wonderful treats. Maybe some soup. Happy birthday Gram.

Winter veggies have inner appeal

The best thing you can say about winter vegetables is that they're unpretentious. The worst thing you can say is that they're drab and unattractive. Their very name prompts a lifted eyebrow. Who could become enchanted across a crowded produce aisle with something called "rutabaga?" And doesn't "parsnip" put you in mind of "Edward Scissorhands?"

But, like many plain people, winter vegetables are beautiful inside, and are packed with fiber besides. Often, rutabagas, parsnips, celery root and their country cousins are found languishing in an obscure corner of the produce section, upstaged by glamorous Chilean imports.

Look for them — their earthy flavor adds character to soups, stews and roasts, comfort foods that steam kitchen windows and make winter tolerable.

"A few years ago, winter vegetables sold mainly to older customers," said Nino Salvaggio, owner of Nino's Strawberry Hills in Farmington Hills. "But that's changing. There's more emphasis on traditional cooking, generally, and the glossy food magazines have started featuring turnips, parsnips, and other less trendy vegetables in their pages."

Throw some parsnips, rutabagas or celery root in the pot with your potatoes, and mash them together when they're cooked. It's a simple way to give potatoes more flavor and food value, and a good way to acquaint your taste buds with unfamiliar vegetables.

Rutabagas are a very good source of vitamin A. Cut up some parsnips and rutabaga, and put them in the roaster with carrots and potatoes when you roast a chicken.

Root vegetables are much more a part of the European cooking tradition than the American.

"Anybody can make spectacular dishes if they have a bucketful of fois gras or a huge black truffle," said Elwin Greenwald of Elwin's Tu Go in Royal Oak who teaches French Peasant Cooking at Kitchen Glamor stores. "But for real home cooking like you find in the little bistros in France, you can't do without peasant vegetables like turnips or rutabagas or parsnips."

"I love to puree these vegetables separately, along with carrots and beets, and create an artist's palette on a plate, with portions of each vegetable creating the overall color scheme."

Jicama, a traditional Mexican root vegetable, is

certainly unattractive enough, said Greenwald. But underneath its thick skinned exterior, jicama (pronounced Hee-cah-mah) is crisp, slightly sweet, and tastes a lot like water chestnuts. Jicama is delicious raw, and is wonderful in salads. It isn't usually served alone, but is perfect combined with other vegetables in stir-frys.

"Give a European the smallest plot of ground and he will plant a garden," said Swiss-born Chef Leopold Schaeli who teaches at Schoolcraft College. "Root vegetables are ideal for the small garden because you can leave them in the ground until you want to eat them. In some cases, freezing actually improves the flavor."

Celery root is knobby and misshapen, but Schaeli said it's a favorite with Europeans. It has the delicate flavor of celery, to which it's related, and adds a lot of depth and mellowness to soups and stews.

"There's so much you can do with these vegetables once you get past their rough exterior," he said. "They can be pureed, creamed, sauteed, used in soups or stews, combined with other vegetables, and almost all of them are delicious eaten raw."

while easing the cork from the neck, releasing it with a soft sigh, not a loud pop.

Serve in flutes or tulip-shaped glasses. A tall, slender glass allows the refined bubbles to rise without disappearing quickly. Six glasses per bottle is a generous pour.

"Give the sustenance and fuel that true passion requires," Casanova

said.

The higher tannins of rose champagne pair it handsomely to grilled beef or lamb or these meals with light sauces. Older, well-cellared rose champagnes (1979 vintage perhaps) are especially wonderful with lamb entrees.

Gymnasts fall to Salem; nip Westland John Glenn

Success is measured in many different ways.

So when the Mustang gymnastic squad fell 138-121 to Plymouth Canton Monday, Northville assistant coach Dawn Klee didn't get upset. Instead, she took pride in several excellent performances by her gymnasts.

"I'm more concerned with how the girls perform than wins and losses," Klee said. "If they do well, I'm happy."

One such performance came in the meet's very first event by Leslie Allen. The senior posted an 8.45 on the vault, which was a season high.

"She's usually pretty consistent," Klee said. "Vault is her best (event)."

Cindy Phillips was nearly as good with an 8.1. Lisa Hojnacki notched a 7.75 and Lindsay Ferguson a 7.55.

In the uneven bars, Phillips was Northville's high scorer with a 7.75. Allen followed with a 7.65 and Hojnacki a personal best of 7.25. Kajal Parikh had a 6.70.

Canton was well in control of the meet at the end of the first two events. The Chiefs led 67.45-61.2.

Parikh took top honors on the balance beam with a 7.4. Laurel Crossman wasn't far behind with a 7.35 while Hojnacki and Phillips both had 7.3.

In the floor exercise, Kristi Darkowski led with a 7.95 while Phillips took a 7.85. Hojnacki scored a 7.8 and Allen a 7.6.

"We were pretty consistent all the way through the meet," Klee said.

Northville is 2-4 on the season. In just a few weeks, the gymnasts will move into state competition at the regional level. Athletes must meet

a specific score in each event four times to qualify, Klee said.

A number of Mustangs have qualified in one or several events including: Hojnacki, Wendy Forster, Phillips and Sarah Kolb on the vault; Allen, Phillips and Kolb in the uneven bars; Crossman, Parikh and Kolb in the beam; Darkowski, Parikh and Allen on the floor.

CANTON INVITATIONAL: The Mustangs first traveled to the home of the Chiefs Jan. 6 for the 18-school tournament.

Northville placed 12th with 126.45. Plymouth Salem easily outdistanced the rest of the field with a winning total of 145.75. Klee said despite a nearly 10-hour day for the gymnasts the tournament went well.

"I'm pretty happy with where we finished," she said.

The Mustangs posted their highest marks of the day in the vault. Kolb finished with an 8.9, Allen an 8.3, Phillips an 8.1 and Hojnacki a 7.9.

Kolb led Northville in each event. She had an 8.5 on the uneven bars while teammate Phillips notched an 8.2. Allen scored 7.55 and Parikh a 6.65.

On the balance beam, Kolb finished with a 7.8. Crossman a 7.6, Parikh a 7.3 and Allen a 6.9. Kolb had an 8.6 on the floor, Allen an 8.3, Par-

ikh an 8.1 and Phillips an 8.0.

Among level one performers, Kolb placed 10th overall.

NORTHVILLE 127.85, WESTLAND JOHN GLENN 122.25: The Mustangs took their second victory of the campaign at home on Feb. 4.

"We went in with the attitude that they've beat us for the last two years, so let's beat them," Klee commented.

The coach said her team knew they could beat John Glenn.

"We went in with a positive attitude," Klee said. "It makes a big difference when you can do it."

An indication of how the meet would go came in the vault. Kolb was nearly flawless in scoring a 9.1. Klee said Kolb executed a full and half twist in her vault, a very difficult maneuver.

Phillips followed in strong fashion with an 8.8. Allen scored an 8.4 and Forster an 8.

In the uneven bars, Kolb was tops again with an 8.45. Phillips had an 8.25, Allen a 7.15 and Hojnacki a 6.6.

Kolb continued her fine meet with an 8.8 on the beam. Crossman was next at 7.7. Allen and Jenny Sekerka each had a 7.

Allen finished with an 8.35 on the floor while Forster had an 8.15. Parikh notched an 8.1 and Darkowski an 8.05.

Party on with Wayne, Garth and 'SNL Music A Go-Go'

NBC's *Saturday Night Live* made a commitment to music with its very first broadcast on Oct. 11, 1975, which featured musical guests Janis Ian and Billy Preston. The performance venue created by *SNL* had no equal in television; artists could gain unprecedented exposure playing live before an audience of millions. The show had always been democratic in its choice of performers, presenting not only the hottest musical acts of the day (The Rolling Stones, Blondie, The Cars), but also the up-and-coming (Stevie Ray Vaughan, The Replacements, Public Enemy). Likewise, mainstream artists like Ray Charles, Martha Reeves and Paul Simon were given equal time with fringe acts such as The B-52s, Frank Zappa and Devo.

Sunday, Feb. 21, NBC recalls many of the musical highlights of *SNL*'s 18-year history in the two-hour special *Wayne & Garth's Saturday Night Live Music A Go-Go*.

As the title suggests, the guides for this journey through the past are public-access TV heroes Wayne Campbell (Mike Myers) and his best bud, Garth Algar (Dana Carvey). Their rallying cry of "Party on!"

sets a "most excellent" tone for this collection of melodious memories, including the time Aerosmith dropped by Wayne's basement studio to jam.

Other clips recall Bruce Springsteen's first-ever television performance, Madonna's subdued though ratings-grabbing gig from last month, the music with a mission of The Blues Brothers (Dan Aykroyd and John Belushi) and the folk style of frequent guest Paul Simon (who once sang "Still Crazy After All These Years" dressed in a turkey suit). And there's much more: Eric Clapton, Whitney Houston, Roy Orbison, Pearl Jam and Stevie Wonder.

Knowing that any *SNL* special must have its quota of laughs, the producers have included moments with Bill Murray as Nick the Lounge Singer (accompanied on piano by *Late Night With David Letterman*'s Paul Schaffer) and *Weekend Update* contributor "Opera Man" (Adam Sandler). And there are musical impersonations, such as Eddie Murphy as Stevie Wonder and Jan Hooks as Sinead O'Connor.

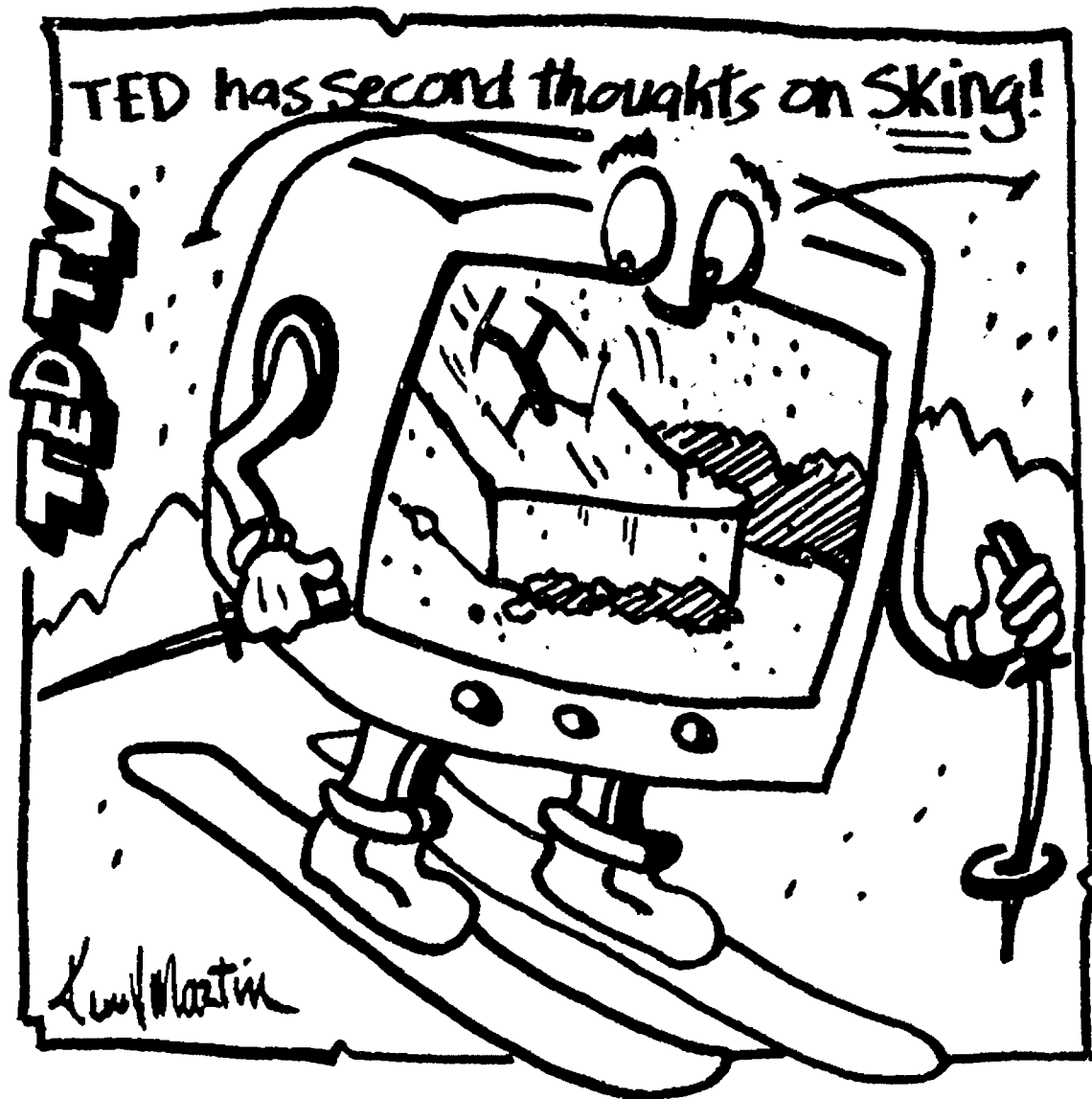
Over the years, *SNL* has consistently been television's best barometer of popular music,

showcasing the biggest names and the newest trends for the widest audience. From K.C. and the Sunshine Band's *SNL* appearance during the disco years to Nirvana and Pearl Jam's delivery of grunge rock to America in the '90s, *SNL* continually proves it knows which way the wind blows.

The foundation of this musical dynasty is in its title: The performances are "live," without retakes or the layering of tracks. While the spontaneity allows for a fresher feel to the music, the live situation has also opened the door for broadcasting nightmares. Patti Smith ended a song on the show by cursing the censors, although she had not been censored. Elvis Costello changed songs after a few bars, opting to sing his denouncement of the broadcasting industry, "Radio, Radio." During a lackluster performance by The Rolling Stones (they had partied too much through the week of rehearsals), Mick Jagger licked the lips of guitarist Ron Wood, to the horror of new NBC president Fred Silverman.

The biggest controversy arose last year during Sinead O'Connor's appearance. O'Connor, who had been provided a 42-piece orchestra by *SNL*, announced on the day of the show she would sing Bob Marley's "War" a cappella and conclude by holding up a photo of a Bosnian child. As millions of viewers know, the picture turned out to be one of the pope, which she tore to pieces. That was the second time O'Connor used *SNL* as a political platform; the Irish singer canceled an earlier appearance to protest the show's booking of comedian Andrew Dice Clay as host.

The musical stage of *SNL* has attained sort of a mystical status where anything can happen. Simon and Garfunkel reunited for *SNL*, and if creator/producer Lorne Michaels had had his way, The Beatles would have done so, too. In the 1970s, when sundry promoters and producers were offering the Fab Four millions of dollars for a reunion concert, Michaels went on the air with an offer for The Beatles to play *SNL* for scale. The Beatles declined.

Dream comes true for Billy Ray Cyrus

Many a life has its fateful turning point. Country music star Billy Ray Cyrus says a letter from his dad was pivotal for him.

As a teen, Cyrus had a professional baseball tryout with the Cincinnati Reds, but he was too slow. When he was 20, he picked up the guitar and started a band on the same day. Dreams of landing a recording contract took him to Los Angeles in 1984, but he wound up selling cars to survive. Unable to devote himself to his musical dream, he was feeling down and depressed when a letter came from his dad back in Flatwoods, Ky. The father advised his son to get home and get down to following his dream.

"When I read that letter I knew it was time to go back to my roots," Cyrus says.

He took what he had learned about the music industry in California and applied it in Nashville. That put him on the path to *Some Gave All*, the biggest-selling album of 1992.

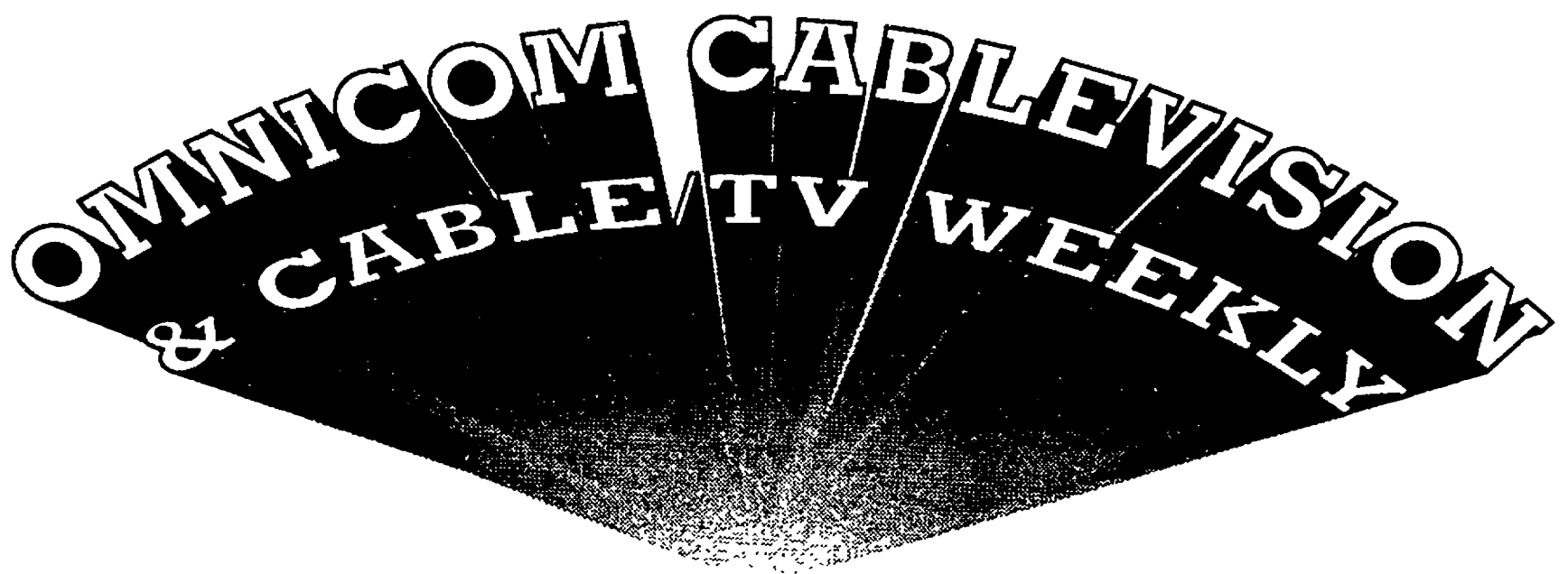

Harris bears wilderness; 'Tom Jones' bears repeating

Q: I'm trying to find out the name of a movie about a man who was mauled by a bear and left to die. A band of Indians also came by but left him alone. The man managed to survive and set out to find the men who left him. He found them just as that same band of Indians began to attack them. The Indians let the man who was mauled walk free. What is the name of this movie and who starred in it? —Lorraine Rubin, Bruce Crossing, Mich.

A: The name of the picture you describe is 1971's *Man in the Wilderness*, an engrossing tale of survival starring Richard Harris, who also starred in a similarly themed film titled *A Man Called Horse*. John Huston plays the gravelly leader of Harris' former gang who makes the big mistakes of counting Harris out and not being particularly cordial to the Indians.

Q: Was there a sequel to *Tom Jones*? I have asked everyone, and no one seems to know. You are my last

resort. —Betty Carroll, Tulsa, Okla.

A: There was never a sequel per se made of Tony Richardson's multiple Oscar-winning film, *Tom Jones* (1963), which was adapted from the Henry Fielding novel. (The film was cut and re-issued in 1989.) *The Bawdy Adventures of Tom Jones* (1976), featuring Joan Collins, was a lesser effort drawn from the London stage musical.

Q: Years ago, there was a series called *Buckskin* on television. Can you tell me the characters' names and who played them? —Freda Summar, Bolivar, Mo.

A: *Buckskin* was a Western drama series that first ran from July 1958 to September 1959 and was rerun six years later in the summer of 1965. Many different characters came and went through the tiny little frontier town of Buckskin, Mont., but there were three regulars who appeared in virtually every episode. They were: Jody O'Connell, an adventurous 10-year-old, played by Tommy Nolan; Annie O'Connell, Tommy's mother and the proprietor of a

local boardinghouse, played by Sallie Brophy; and Marshal Tom Sellers, local do-gooder, played by Michael Road.

Q: Years ago, I saw a movie titled *The View From Pompeii's Head*, starring Richard Egan. I can't remember the actress who starred with him. Can you search it out and let me know? It was such a good movie. —Mae Olinger, Rogers, Ark.

A: *The View From Pompey's Head* was released in 1955. This picture stars Egan as a young lawyer who returns to his hometown, Pompey's Head, to tackle an embezzlement case steeped in racial and social prejudice. The film was written, produced and directed by Phillip Dunne and based on the epic novel of the same title by Hamilton Basso. British actress Dana Wynter plays the love interest of Egan's character in the film.

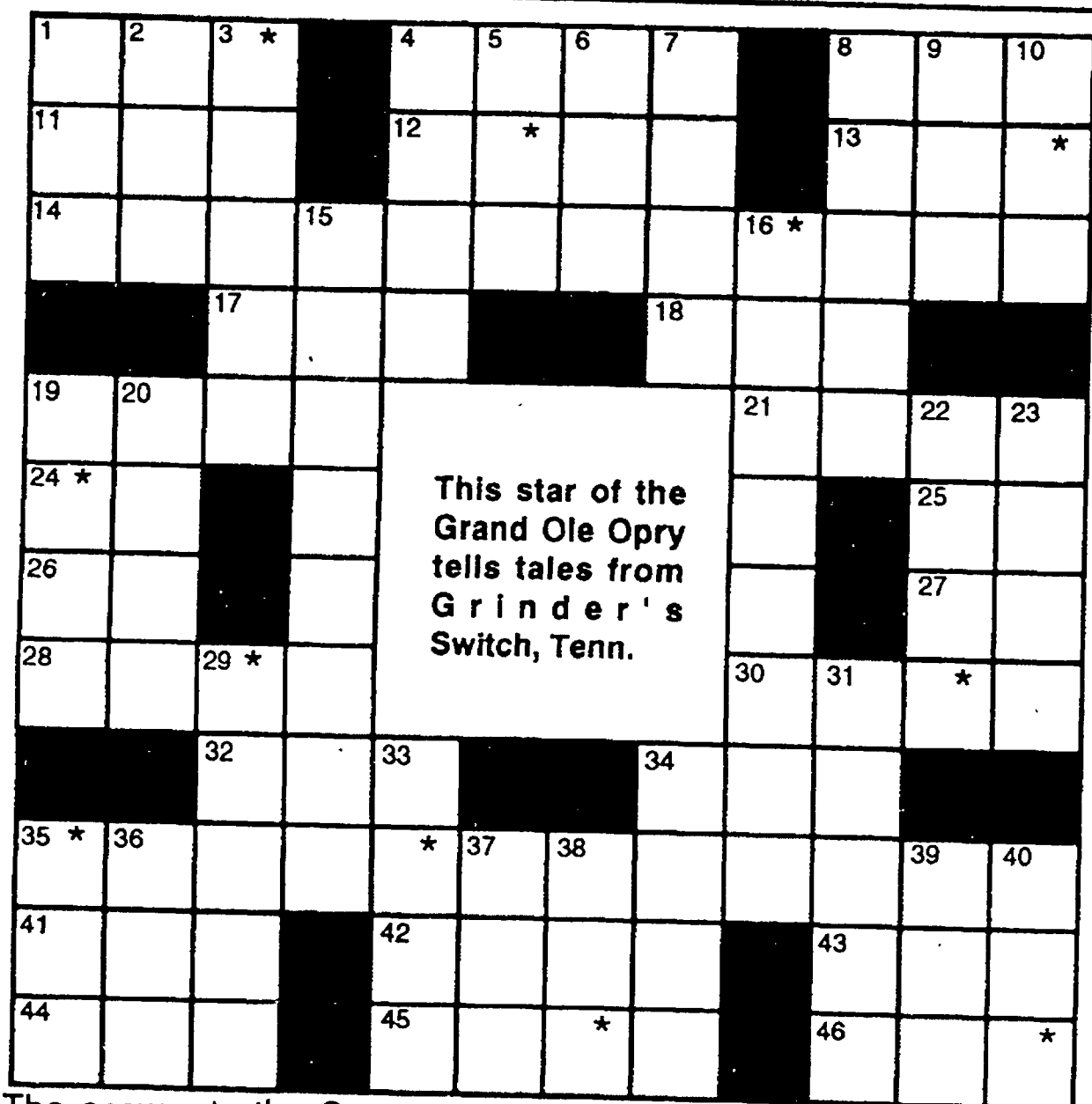

Lucci still enjoys playing Erica

It is difficult to believe Susan Lucci is in her 23rd year of portraying the seductress Erica Kane on *All My Children*.

"Michael is a dream and he gives 100 percent all the time," says Lucci. "He's charming, handsome and he is excellent in the part. What more could you ask for?"

She says the future for the couple holds "lots of turmoil and trouble, because Erica can never be really happy."

For each of the past 13 years as Erica, Lucci has been nominated for an Emmy award and lost. Unlike the character she plays, Lucci is always diplomatic and often pokes fun at the fact she has lost so many times.

In some recent dialogue on AMC, the character Edmund commented that Erica deserved an Oscar for her performance, and she replied "I'd settle for the Emmy."

"That line was actually in the script, and at first I was a little afraid to do it, but it turned out okay," says Lucci.

She may not win an Emmy, but you get the feeling that most things turn out "okay" for this talented actress.

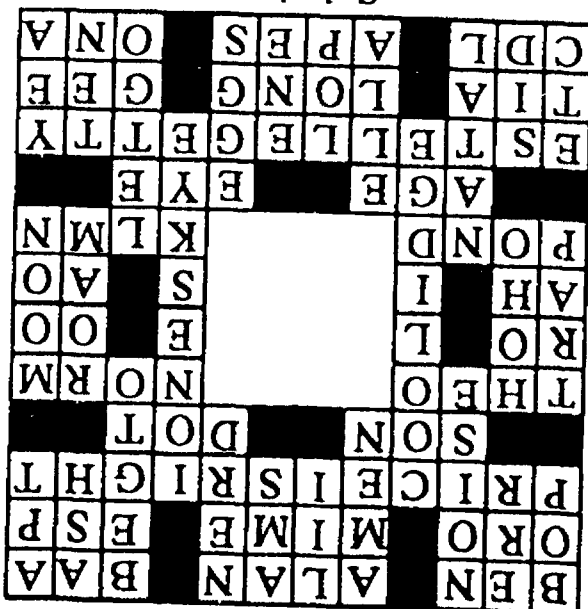
