Developer sought for township land

Wayne County officials are proceeding with more caution this time in their search for a developer for the former training school site in Northville Township.

"I think we have not been interested in plunging ahead kind of nilly willy with this thing," said Bill Wild, the county's director of Business Develop-

ment Center. Wild said a team of county officials is still reviewing six new bids received in April for the development of the 695-acre parcel that lies between

Five and Six Mile, bisected by Sheldon Road. The county official said the selection team sought two different kinds of proposals in its

March 8 request for proposals (RFP). Four months ago, the county asked developers to respond if they were interested in either developing the land as a single project or if they wanted to act as construction managers on behalf of the county, which would become the developer.

Of the six responses that made the April 16 RFP deadline, Wild said only two developers offered to tackle the entire parcel as a single mixed-use development. The other four, he said, agreed to act as construction managers.

Plymouth developer Robert DeMattia was the only one to respond to both RFPs, Wild said. De-Mattia's response was no surprise to county officials, even though his last proposed endeavor for the site, Huntington Falls, was foiled last year due

From the looks of the RFPs, the county hopes to proceed with the plan to develop the site as a single planned unit development (PUD) as outlined in the township's master plan and in the RFP. Wild says even though developers in the past have hail problems raising money to develop the entire 695 acres, he still thinks it's a viable option.

"It's possible," he said hesitantly.

The RFP asked developers to respond with "a high-quality mixed use development." Using the PUD option in the township's zoning ordinance, the county sought projects that proffered a minimum of 200-300 acres of single family residential; 20-100 acres of multi-family residential; 200-300 acres of research and development and 10-400 acres of office and business.

City considers strategy to sell bonds to voters By STEVE KELLMAN Staff Writer

Downtown Development Authority members huddled Wednesday morning to plan a strategy for selling their Mainstreet '93 plan to city

The strategy, to be hammered out in more detail with the Northville Community Chamber of Commerce, will include face-to-face meetings with downtown merchants and landlords as well as an informational forum for all city voters.

The DDA and chamber have divided up the task of selling the DDA's \$4.2 million plan to replace the Cady Street deck, build a tabletop deck south of MainCentre and pave a large lot along East Cady. While DDA members agreed to buttonhole merchants, the chamber will focus its attention on the larger community.

Their common goal is to win approval of the Mainstreet '93 plan by city voters at a special July 27 election. What voters will be asked to do is back the \$3.5 million in bonds to fi-

nance much of the deck project. A voter-approved project should cost the city less in interest payments over the 11-year life of the funding plan since investors are more likely to grant it a favorable interest rate. No millage increase is involved since the project will be funded through tax capturing, parking credits and special assessments on downtown property owners. But if the plan's financial projections fall short of covering bond payments, the city will be required to cover the difference through any means necessary in-

cluding a millage increase. City Manager Gary Word noted

School officials make suggestions for tax revisions

Northville School District officials admittedly are having some trouble following the school finance reform ball that is being bounced around by lawmakers and would like to have some game time of their own.

So, the Wayne County Association of School Administrators (WCASA) called a time out and came up with its own list of rules it hopes the Legislature will play by.

Four months ago we (the WCASA) testified as a group," Supt. Leonard Rezmierski told board members at Monday night's Northville Board of Education meeting. We identified

seven areas and came up with an educational priority issue paper.

The group maintains the following principles: No mandate from the Legislature for local school district action with-

out full state funding should be enacted. • Tax relief to the taxpayers of the state must be accompanied by full

reimbursement to local school district budgets. A commitment by the Legislature

to school finance and tax policy which provides stability and predictability and fosters rational financial planning by local school districts

City vows to work with firm eyeing Ford Plant

The city and the company may disagree on the details, but Northville City Council members made clear Wednesday they will work closely with R & D Enterprises in the firm's attempt to purchase and occupy the vacant Ford Valve Plant.

Judging from comments received from audience members at Wednesday's special study session, many local residents would welcome the new neighbor and new city taxpayer.

R & D Enterprises, now located at 19430 Gerald Ave., is a fastgrowing firm that manufactures heat exchangers for the marine industry. The firm has been negotiating with the Ford Motor Co. for months to buy the plant at 235 E. Main and move out of its current cramped facility.

As R & D President Richard D. Cox told the council Wednesday, "We are busting at the seams. We have contracts that will not allow us to stay there past November."

The 28-member firm would bring with it Acorn Stamping Inc., a 10-member stamping operation now located in Rochester.

To make the move, though, R & D wants the city to grant it a tax abatement and buy 2.4 acres of land now used as a parking lot across Griswold from the plant. The city would be given the four acres west of Griswold known as Ford Field and an additional four acres north and east of the plant itself, including the Middle Rouge River waterway and the duck feeding area downstream from the plant's waterwheel.

We want to retain just enough parking area and whatnot to run the plant," Cox said.

While R & D's initial offer to Ford was based on the city's purchase of the 2.4 acres west of Griswold for \$350,000, City Manager Gary Word recommended that the price be limited to \$200,000 and said the city

should seek an option on the prop-

erty rather than buy it outright.
Word noted that the land could be used for additional recreational space or a library site, and said if the property is used for recreational space, the city could apply for state Department of Natural Resources grants to fund much of the purchase

But Parks and Recreation Director Traci Johnson said after the meeting that such grants could not be used to fund property acquisition after it has been purchased.

Also unresolved is the issue of a tax abatement, which could be granted for up to 12 years at a rate of 50 percent. Word said the city would seek a shorter abatement, if any.

Word raised concerns about the dam east of the plant, and said he wanted assurances from Ford that the dam was in good condition.

The city should not accept a dam that's in poor condition," he said. Executive Ray Scheich, who works

for Ford's property disposition department, said the automotive company had agreed to fund a study of the dam's condition. He said the twoweek study should begin sometime

School chief defends against claims made in CBN pamphlet

But the superintendent took exception to some recent criticism handed out by Citizens for a Better Northville (CBN) in the form of a pamphlet distributed the day before and the day of the June 14 miliage election.

Responding to Rezmierski's statements. Bernard would only say, that's as unfair as handing out [millage) information to school kids to take home to their parents."



David Jerome, president of the Junior Baseball Board, disagreed with Cox's assertion that two ball diamonds could be placed on the current Ford Field but he noted that recreation groups would be much more likely to make improvements at the field if it was turned over to the city.

Questions about potential environmental hazards at the plant drewa response from Scheich, who noted that Ford is working with Michigan Department of Natural Resource offlcials over oil seeping into the waterway from the other side of the river. Studies by Ford indicate that the

oil is most likely from abandoned oil reclamation lagoons located across the railroad tracks on property now owned by General Oil, since its composition is different from the oils used by Ford at its plant. He said the DNR is working with

General Oil officials to dig a containment trench on the far side of the waterway to divert the oil before it enters the Rouge.

We have the MDNR's opinion that we as property owners are not responsible (for the pollution), and they are working with the responsible party," he said.

R & D would add a new 51-space parking lot north of the plant, to complement the 18 spaces it would main-

Scheich noted that Ford has shouldered that liability for years.

Mayor Chris Johnson asked for information on the tax revenue that would result from any tax abatement after Finance Officer Mark Christiansen noted that the empty property now generates \$36,000 in annual tax revenue, \$9,800 of which goes into city coffers.

Johnson added that any tax abatement should be accompanied by an agreement from R & D that the firm would remain in the plant for a substantial period of time, to avoid a situation like General Motors' pullout from its Willow Run plant in Ypsilanti.

that he had asked chamber board vice president Ann Willis and "curmudgeon-at-large" Bill Sliger, a former DDA member involved in the passage of Mainstreet '78, to brief the DDA on marketing efforts for the new Mainstreet project.

Willis told the DDA that since most of the city's formal public hearings on Mainstreet '93 are complete, now we're concentrating on the vote."

She noted that the vote itself differs from elections for items like school millages that impact the voters directly in increased taxes and added that a "no" vote will not necessarily mean the end of the project, since the city's need for assured parking and its obligation to Singh Development will not go away.

"It's a little different than saying 'I don't want a parking decks.' That's not the nature of the vote," she said.

City officials are revising their marketing strategy after a surprisingly low turnout at a June 28 public hearing on the plan. The council had scheduled an overflow meeting for the next night in case the hearing went late, but approved the plan in an hour June 28 after receiving only a handful of comments and critiques.

Willis said that may be a sign that the city has already answered much of the criticism of its original deck plan by shaving \$2 million off its cost and reducing its impact on tax revenue to Northville Public Schools.

Sliger noted that Mainstreet 78 failed the first time it went to a vote, mostly because the city not have the support of downtown merchants. The merchants were opposed to the city's plan to make Main Street oneway, and only after the plan was revised to keep two-way traffic on Main Street was it passed by the voters.

The latest criticism of Mainstreet '93 came from within the authority rather than without, when DDA Member Jim Long criticized the \$700,000 already spent on land acquisition and design work for previous deck plans.

"That's a lot of money spent for no buildings at this point," Long said.

Long also asked whether the city had sought bids before deciding to refer engineering of the latest deck project to its parking consultants, Rich & Associates of Southfield. DDA Member Greg Presley noted that the city could save money by sticking with Rich & Associates, which had done the design work on previous deck projects, since the projects had common elements.


Presley asked whether the authority could be involved in letting the contract for the actual construction, or at least reviewing it.

"It seems to me that if we're going to be involved in the bricks and mortar, we should be involved in the contracting, too," he said.

Word noted that the deck plan is ultimately a city project rather than a DDA project, but agreed to let Presley and Long review the contract.



Township police assist in solving bank robbery

Northville Township Police assisted Livonia officers in the arrest of a man who allegedly robbed the Comerica Bank at Eight Mile and Haggerty roads Monday.

Northville Police Lieutenant Gary

Batzloff said the 32-year-old Detroit man pulled up to the drive-in window at the bank around 11:45 a.m. He allegedly passed a note to the teller demanding an unspecified amount of cash and threatened to harm bank employees and patrons if she didn't

the note. Northville police said.

The bank teller sent the man

\$1,250 in cash through the automated system and he fled the scene. A bank employee notified township police, who, in turn, alerted the Livonia Police Department.

"It was our quick repsponse and dissemination of information that helped Livonia officers nab the guy,"

Batzloff said the teller's partial description of the suspect, his car and license plate also helped lead Livonia Police to the suspect's trail at Five Mile and Newburgh roads.

Livonia officers sighted the car at A single silver bullet was taped to Five Mile and attempted to stop the

suspect to no avail. A high speed police chase ensued and ended with the suspect colliding with a police cruiser at Schoolcraft and Merriman. The man then reportedly jumped out of the car and fled on foot.

Batzloff said officers arrested the suspect minutes later. Police recovered the note, bullet and all of the money in the man's car, the lieutenant said.

Livonia police intend to turn the man over to federal investigators to face stiffer charges, Batzloff said. Suspects face longer penalities for bank robbery under federal law. He will be arraigned in federal court later

State House wants feds to grant Michigan air quality upgrade

State lawmakers introduced a House resolution recently, asking the Environmental Protection Agency to reclassify southeast Michigan as meeting federal clean air quality standards, announced state Rep. Bill Bullard, R-Milford.

Southeast Michigan is currently designated as an ozone nonattainment area under the Clean Air Act although it has not violated national standards since 1990.

Ozone levels in Oakland, Wayne and Macomb counties have been falling since the 1980s," said Bullard, who co-sponsored the resolution. *Our success at reducing air pollution levels shows how a cooperative effort between the public and private sectors can benefit residents and industry alike."

According to the Department of Natural Resources, before an area can ask for reclassification, certain criteria must be met. They include: Meeting the federal ozone standard for three years.

 EPA approval of a state implementation plan, detailing what steps Michigan will take to keep air quality in compliance with Clean Air Act

A permanent and enforceable im-

provement in air quality. Submission of a 10-year maintenance plan to ensure future stan-

dards are met. A vehicle maintenance program to monitor and control automotive exhaust

Areas complying before Nov. 15 may avoid some of the ozone control measures under the Clean Air Act amendments, according to the DNR. Areas that do not achieve attainment on schedule are subject to further control measures including stiff financial penalties.

"We have a win-win solution," Bullard said. "Oakland County's citizens benefit from cleaner air, and by meeting federal standards, the business community keeps itself in compliance, thus avoiding stricter restrictions which tend to inhibit

dent has a 10-percent option, while other administrators have a 7-percent option). The two assistant superintendents have a sub-total salary in the \$85,000 range while central office directors and supervisors' sub-total salaries range from \$40,000 to \$68,000.



City's downtown alive and in good condition

The closing of three downtown businesses within a week of each other has given rise to a new round of eulogizing from those who like to forecast the imminent demise of the small town main street business district.

In late June, Northville Pharmacy, V & S Variety and Juan Carlos Restaurant all closed their doors for good. A change in policy from Blue Cross/Blue Shield forced the pharmacy to go out of business after generations of community service, while a prolonged lack of business proved the undoing of V & S and Juan Carlos.

The closings came as a disappointment to those who patronized the stores, but the rapid turn of events should not, in our view, be taken as a sign that downtown Northville is in danger of folding up. Generally speaking, the downtown is healthy and vibrant and has survived tougher challenges than that posed by the closing of a pharmacy, a Mexican restaurant and a discount variety store.

Gigantic malls and mega-stores such as Twelve Oaks, Meijer, Target and the Source Club are formidable obstacles for the downtown to overcome. Northville. like other cities across the state and country, cannot hope to compete with the mind-boggling array of merchandise displayed under the roofs of these mammoth commercial centers, and merchants have been forced to offer unique products and services as an alternative drawing card.

But an astonishing number of Northville business operators have risen to the occasion and carved out their own market niches. Businesses such as Genitti's, Crawfords', MacKinnon's, Lapham's and Perrin's, to name just a few, have found large followings and prospered in spite of the trend toward shopping in outlying areas.

Overall, the city has undergone farreaching changes in offering an impress-

ive assortment of specialty stores, fine restaurants and accessible offices, and has proven that, even in these days of one-stop shopping and high-speed mobility, the small downtown can remain viable and alive.

One of the merchants who folded up shop last month blamed the failure of her business on a stagnating downtown, even going so far as to proclaim North-ville "dead." Given the number of successful downtown merchants, the considerable amount of interest from businesses seeking to locate here and the high volume of pedestrian traffic on downtown sidewalks, we would advise this individual to think again. It is far more likely that the closing of the store could be attributed to the nature of the business or to a pattern of sub-standard

We, like many, are saddened that small downtowns can no longer sustain the kind of folksy store operator who once ran the friendly 5 & 10, the laidback barber shop or the personalized drug store. Today's business operators must be astute, savvy marketing experts with one eye firmly fixed on a dynamic and fast-paced commercial scene.

But new market trends demand new market approaches and Northville, more so than most small cities, has succeeded in adapting to the new conditions.

Northville's downtown is indeed changing but it is by no means dying. Those who claim it is need only look around to see how wrong they are.

Playing with facts is a widespread practice

Northville School District Supt. Leonard Rezmierski issued a sharp rebuttal last week to the election flyer produced by the organization Citizens for a Better

Northville. The pamphlet listed several reasons for opposing the June 14 millage request, and was distributed the day be-

fore and the day of the vote. As is usually the case with opposition literature, no names or telephone numbers of individuals appeared on the flyer. Only the name and the post office box of the organization were listed on the document.

Many of the claims included in the pamphlet were, in fact, carelessly worded and poorly researched. For example, the flyer maintained that Rezmierski's leased automobile contained a cellular phone. It does not.

It also asserted that the school district paid the airfare for an administrator's trip to Arizona. In reality, the trip in question actually resulted in a reduced airfare because the administrator added to his itinerary a visit to his family in Ar-

izona the Saturday before an educa tional conference in Texas.

But if some of the claims made in the flyer were haphazard and slipshod, others deserve a closer look. For instance, Rezmierski disputed the contention that the district paid \$1 for a bottle of water at last fall's strategy planning session. But, an invoice itemizing expenses of the session does, in fact, include a \$2 expenditure for two bottles of water.

Further, the superintendent claimed that the flyer was inaccurate in saying that central office administators cost the district an average of \$100,000 a year. He said the average administrator's salary is roughly \$84,000.

However, the flyer didn't say anything about salaries, it mentioned "costs." When additional expenses such as fringe benefits are included in the calculation, it might well be that administrators' costs average \$100,000 a year.

Unless we're missing something, it appears that both sides were playing with meanings in order to suit their purposes.

Save the plane fare. Blair Bowman and company have fixed up one of the exhibit halls at the Novi Expo Center to create the Novi Expo Beach Club.

Well, saying they've 'fixed up' may be overstating it. In short, it looks like a Jimmy Buffett hallucination that's run amok. Exhibit Hall B has been decorated with beach balls, banners,

palm trees and sand to create something that reminds me of senior prom on a low budget. "We were going for the cheap wedding look," said Bowman,

tongue in cheek. "And I think we've achieved that." This bar/nightclub/hangout will operate through the summer, taking advantage of the slack season for shows at

the Expo Center. I had a chance to take in the atmosphere through the haze of a couple of tropical concoctions last Wednesday night after

my meeting at the Motorsports Museum wrapped up. It reminds me a lot of the Atlantis Club in Kill Devil Hills, N.C., an honest-to-goodness, on-the-beach dance joint which becomes my home away from home for a week each

Like the Atlantis, the Novi Expo Beach Club is a big open room with tables, chairs, a bar, a band and pool tables. Live entertainment is scheduled Thursdays, Fridays and

The Expo gets a bit more extreme, however. There are dart boards for which the bartender will gladly give you some really good darts - no plastic cheapies. (Don't think of swiping them, though. They take a major credit card in exchange.)

Basketball backboards have been hung on the walls.

If you want to lie in the sand with Forget about that pint-size Pop-a-Shot that other bars offer you. This is the real thing, thrown elbows and all.

There are two sand volleyball courts outside, marking the first time in recent memory that people have had good things to say about the Expo Center parking lot. Inside the building another volleyball court has been marked off, but for some. reason, the shuffleboard courts were getting far more attention on the night I was there.

Sand has been trucked in and piled in the corners with plenty of beach toys and tools to build sand castles. The pillars supporting the roof have been covered in pipe wrap. which creates a strikingly realistic facsimile of a palm tree stalk. The fronds above, I'm told, are real, though.

Northville Record last Monday know that Record editor Lee Snider was in an automobile accident the previous week. You know it because we carried a story about it on the front page.

Those of you who read The Novi News know it as well because Snider and News editor Mike Malott wrote about it in their columns which appeared in both the Northville and Novi editions on

Thursday. The two columns came at the incident from different angles. Snider recounted the accident and said he had learned his lesson about the importance of wearing seatbelts. Malott talked about the decisions involved in reporting the accident on the front page as we did in Northville's Monday edition.

Was it a tough decision to run the story about Snider's accident? Not at all. In fact, it was an easy decision.

Those of us in the community journalism business are accused of many things, sometimes justly, sometimes unjustly. One of the unjust criticisms is that we protect our own. One of the basic rules here at The Record is that everybody

gets treated the same. It's a matter of integrity. If Joe Citizen gets his name in the paper for being arrested for drunk driving or shoplifting or anything else, so does Promiment Local Official. Being mayor or school board presi-

must be established.

• The commitment to the concept of local governance must be maintained. The seven areas identified by the

WCASA that need to be addressed by lawmakers include the following:

• 1. Equity of opportunity. The group recommends the state do away with inequities in education by instituting the Olmstead-Kearney for-mula. Also known as the O-K plan, the proposal calls for tapping the lot-tery for school funding which would increase state support to schools to 50 percent; roll back millage rates to 30 mills with guaranteed state reimbursement of any loss in per-pupil dedicated to the school aid fund.

revenues; and make education Michigan's top budget priority.

• 2. Property tax relief. The WCASA

recommends a flat rate, state-wide property tax to be levied against all real property in Michigan, with proceeds distributed among the school districts of the state.

For immediate action, the group also suggests a 3 percent cap on 1993 assessments.

• 3. Resource adequacy. This can be accomplished by expanding the sales tax base to include taxation of services, closing tax loopholes which permit some to avoid payment of current tax levies, eliminating tax abatements to businesses and industries, and increasing the income tax rate

Control of labor costs by enforcing legislation to penalize public employees who engage in illegal strikes, establishing either a state-wide or regionalized collective bargaining system and passing legislation to control the cost of benefit programs, particularly health and medical insurance premiums.

• 5. School district organization by considering consolidation, consortia, privatization of ancillary services and other strategies designed to reduce costs.

• 6. Special education. Rezmierski said the group suggests the state

rules need to match the federal gov-emment mandates when it comes to special education programs. The Legislature should also reconsider the necessity of an extended full-year program in this area, he said.

 7. Facilities and infrastructure. WCASA recommends a state-wide reinvestment program to include equalization of a tax base for bond service, state grant support for technology investment and the enforcement of facility standards to ensure each child has a safe and appropriate learning environment.

CITY OF NOVI NOTICE OF PROVISIONS OF THE NOXIOUS WEED AND REFUSE ORDINANCE

TO. All owners, occupants or possessors of subdivided lands or lots: NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that in accordance with Section 21-20 of the Novi NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN INBUILD accordance with Section 21-20 of the novi Code, all noxious weeds, or other weeds, grass, brush or deleterious, unhealthy growths exceeding a height of twelve (12) inches, or any refuse or debris growing, standing or lying upon any property in the City of Novi, shall be out down, destroyed or removed as the case may be, at least twice in each year, once during the last half of the month of May and again during the last half of July of each year and more often as

may be necessary. In the event the owner or occupant, or any person or persons, agent, firm or corporation having control or management of any subdivided land in any subdivision in which buildings have been erected and where such subdivisions has a zoning classification that is "residential," shall fail, refuse, or neglect to comply with the above mentioned Ordinance, the City shall cause said weeds, grass, brush, deleterious, unhealthy growths, rubbish or debris to be cut down, destroyed or removed. Provided, turther, that any lands which are situated within the flood plains of any natural streams or any areas holyapen the lower or uncer hanks of stuch streams or or water courses, or any area between the lower or upper banks of such streams or water courses shall be exempted from the provisions of this Ordinance. The expense incurred by the City in the cutting, destruction or removal of same together with a ten (10%) percent administrative charge will be levied and collected against such property

in the manner provided by law.

Failure to comply with the requirements set forth in Section 21-20 of the Novi
Code may also result in the prosecution for same, and liability to the extent of the penalty therein provided.





Dixie Delicacies

Southern pride evident from home cooking

Prudence Hilburn's love of baking began in her mother's kitchen. The youngest of seven children, she watched her mother performing biscuit "magic" every

morning.
The day in her Piedmont, Ala., home began with baking, just as it began in homes throughout the South in the days before packaged baked goods. Although the tradition may be on the wane, Hilbrurn is doing her best to keep it alive with her new cookbook "A Treasury of

Southern Baking (HarperPerennial).

Thope that it isn't dying out," says Hilburn in an interview, "But I see a revival of the baking spirit. It's important to teach children while they're young to develop a love of baking."

But she does admit that times have changed, what with two-income families and not enough time to bake for each meal, as was the custom while she was growing

That's why she includes a "Busy Baker" section in each of the chapters on cakes, cookies, pies and puddings and breads. These quick recipes often use convenience mixes to get tasty results.

"I wanted to write a cookbook that was not intimidating." Hilburn says, "A book people would actually use, that doesn't call for ingredients you can't buy."

Don't let the homespun approach fool you. Hilburn has trained with some of the best chefs in France and New York, including Simone "Simca" Beck, James Beard and Peter Kump of the New York Cooking School. She also writes two weekly columns, one for The New York Times syndicate and the other for the Anniston Star in Anniston, Ala.

Nonetheless, Hilburn remains more the Pillsbury Bake-Off finalist (six times) than the chef cooking fancy dishes in high-priced restaurants.

The mother of four (three girls, one boy) with four grandchildren, Hilburn didn't really start baking until after she married her husband, Huey.

Her first success came in 1963, when she was named a finalist in the Pillsbury Bake-Off for a Tropical Orange

"It had coconut icing and was made with orange juice and other tropical fruits," she recalls. "I got the idea from ambrosia. It's been so long since I made one." Hilburn went on to win so many bake-offs that she

was disqualified. "Not only me," she says. "But my daughters, too!" During this time she worked as an accountant, a job she held for 25 years, but she always saw cookig as

more than a hobby. Deciding to make a career change, she went to New York to study with James Beard, then went with a group from Kump's school to the South of France to study with

Beck, the co-author of Mastering the Art of French Cook-Peter Kump said he wished I was working in New York," Hilburn says, "But I wasn't sure. My husband

said, 'Go for it,' and I decided to give it a try." Her accounting experience served her well because she was able to work in the New York Cooking School's office and "take any course I wanted with any teacher I wanted. It was a real learning experience. I was willing to start at the bottom and do anything to broaden my knowledge.

Then Beard asked her to work with him. Unfortunately, Beard died before she had the opportunity, but he did introduce Hilburn to Barbara Kalka, who wrote the introduction for Southern Baking.

Yet, little of these classic influences seems to have infiltrated Hilburn's recipes.

"I can make a classic butter-cream frosting," she says. But it isn't right with these types of recipes. That kind of cooking can be very elegant. Southern cooking isn't always elegant, but tastes good."

Whether intentional or not, Hilburn has tapped into the growing interest for regional American cuisines. Her emphasis on using prepared mixes and canned ingredients draws on basic American homestyle cooking, ex-

emplified by her Pillsbury Bake-Off honors.

"There is something in the book for everyone," she says. There are recipes easy enough for the weekend baker and recipes tasty enough for the professional."

Many of the recipes were handed down from her mother. Like most home bakers, Hilburn's mother rarely wrote anything down and measured everything by hand, which proved to be a handicap when it came time to write Southern Baking.

To re-create these oral recipes accurately, Hilburn had to rely on her own skills as a baker. "I sat down with a basic layer cake recipe," she says of

her recreation of the Fresh Coconut Cake. "And I worked with it until I got it to taste like

mother's. Once I got it, I knew it by memory." Hilburn notes that the one thing that differentiates

Southern baking is the ingredients; primary among them is flour.

Southern bakers have a fondness for self-rising flour that is usually milled from soft winter wheat. This gives their biscuits that light, fluffy quality that is hard to duplicate with all-purpose flour.

To approximate self-rising flour, Hilburn suggests you add 1 tablespoon baking powder and 1 teaspoon salt to 2 cups all-purpose flour.

Another difference is the use of margarine (or as Southerners call it "oleo") instead of butter, although Hilburn says the choice is up to the individual.

Another ingredient — that has now fallen into disfavor - is lard. It is used in the basic Southern Biscuits

Consider the egg for nutrition and value



Mary **Brady** child one of my fondest memories was spending time with my grandparents. Three out of four were excellent cooks.

Grandfather Smith didn't cook but truly enjoyed eating. When we lived

in Buffalo I would often spend weekends at the Smith house. Later, after moving to Northvile, school and summer vacations

were the times spent with them. The days were leisurely. Reading, napping, eating three squares a day and then

Breakfast was always the same. Two soft boiled eggs, toast with butter. grapefruit, juice and cereal. This meel had been ritual for 75 years. My grandfather's mother cooked the same breakfast when he was a youngster. The only thing that ever changed was hot versus cold cereal and the variety of toast and jams.

Lunch was often a fried egg sandwich or two. My grandfather was extremely weight conscious. Never, never did he go over the recommended weight charts. As a colonel in the Army for three wars, he was well versed in restraint and self control.

He died in 1977 at the age of 92 after a short illness. I remember everyone marveling at how he ate two eggs or more a day, butter, milk, cream and ice cream and that he lived to be healthy and old.

Today, all we hear is to avoid eggs because of the negative effects they carry. Could it be, maybe, that it isn't the eggs but all the other garbage we load into our systems?

Let's consider nutrient density. Nutrient density is a way of evaluating the nutritional quality of a food by comparing the amounts of nutrients it contains against the number of calories it provides.

For an example, a glass of milk contains 160 calories plus significant amounts of protein, calcium, riboflavin and other nutrients. By comparison, an alcoholic drink, containing the same amount of calories, is virtually devoid of any essential nutrient. Thus, the milk is 'nutrient dense" while the alcohol is not.

We each have a "caloric budget" for each day. The food choices we make as we "spend" this budget must supply nutrients as well as fuel. The trick is to choose foods low in calories and high in nutrients before using up your allotment of calories.

This situation presents a "catch-22" dilemma for modern people: Eat more food and you risk obesity, eat less and you risk nutritional deficits! Thus the foods eaten must be more nutrient dense.

Enter the egg.

The egg is one of nature's better nutritional efforts, designed as a total life support system for the developing chick. One serving of two large eggs provides 160 calories and 9 percent of the daily requirement for protein, vitamin A, ribollavin, iron, vitamin D and phosphorous needed by the average woman.

As a source of high quality protein eggs cannot be beat. There are eight essential amino acids or "building blocks" of protein that cannot be manufactured by the body. Foods that contain all eight are called

complete proteins. Eggs, like other animal proteins, fall into this category. The pattern of essential amino acids in the egg is so ideal that it has been used for years as the standard against which other protein foods are judged.

An egg contains all of its fat (6 grams) and cholesterol (265 milligrams) in the yolk. This is where most other nutrients are found also. Remove the yolk and you seriously alter the protein and nutrient content the egg has to offer.

There are three different types of fat in the yolk: polyunsaturated (1 gram) monounsaturated (3 grams) and saturated (2 grams). Because high blood cholesterol has been identified as a risk factor for heart disease, dietary fats and dietary cholesterol have been under intensive study to find out whether and how they influence blood cholesterol.

It has been learned that saturated fats can raise I lood cholesterol in some people, while dietary cholesterol does not seem to have a consistent effect on blood cholesterol.

On the other hand, there is evidence that polyunsaturated fats and perhaps monounsaturated fats may lower blood cholesterol. Research is inconclusive on the effect of cholesterol preent in eggs in relation to blood cholesterol.

Some people show higher blood cholesterol with a high egg diet while others show no effect and in some cases lowered blood cholesterol. These highly varied and individualistic responses cannot be explained as yet. Other risk factors such as smoking and high blood pressure are equally Important.

For people sensitive to dietary saturated fat and cholesterol, eggs should be eaten upon recommendation of your physician. For the rest of us the fat content of the egg provides a good "stick-to-theribs energy kick to fuel the body for hours after consumption.

Finally, eggs are a bargain when it comes to the food budget. By government regulation, one dozen large eggs must weigh 1% pounds. Therefore it is easy to figure the cost per pound. Even at the high price of \$1.20 per dozen eggs cost a mere

\$.90 per pound. Next in line for protein economy is beef liver followed by peanut butter. Thus the egg is one of the least expensive of the high

quality animal proteins. It would be difficult to design a food that compares as favorably, both in nutrients per calorie and nutrients per unit cost.

recipe, although solid vegetable shor-

tening can be substituted.
Still, lard was used widely by Southern cooks until the current emphasis on low-cholesterol cooking. It imparts a certain consistency and texture, particularly in pie-crusts, that is hard to duplicate.

As Hilburn notes, "My mother lived to be 92 and cooked with it daily.

Many of the recipes use the fruits and nuts indigenous to the South, in particular peaches, strawberries, blackberries, pears, pecans, peanuts and black walnuts.

However, certain non-indigenous fruits are ubiquitous in Southern baking, in particular the pineapple and coconut.

Pineapple makes its appearance in the classic upside-down cake (which Hilburn calls Topey-Turvy Pineapple Cake) and an upside down pineapple gingerbread, as well as an ingredient in various fillings and

Canned pineapple is always used, in particular the liquid, as a flavoring

Fresh coconut, however, must be used, in particular for the Fresh Coconut Cake.

"You can't get the same flavor with packaged," says Hilburn. "The fresh is more moist."

Fresh coconuts can be found in most supermarkets. To prepare, take a hammer and nail and punch out one of the "eyes."

Drain the coconut milk and Place the whole coconut in a 200 F to 250 F oven for about 20 minutes. This will make it easier to crack. Once out of the oven, give the coconut a few whacks with the hammer until it

splits. Separate the edible part of the

coconut from the shell and grate. Hilburn says her Sweet Potato Pie is called a "custard" in the South, but her editor insisted she list it as a pie because it has a crust.

The Deep-Dish Fresh Peach cobbler has a unique double-crust that Hilburn says her mother used on all her cobblers.

The trick is to bake the first crust just so it sets. After the top crust cooks the bot-

tom crust has a dumpling-like

She says, This is a family-type cobbler that is good enough for company."

Liquors and liqueurs were rarely found in Southern baking until recently, probably because it's the heart of the Bible Belt. However, Bread Pudding With Bourbon Sauce originated in New Orleans and reflects that city's cosmopolitan

FRESH COCONUT CAKE

To make frosting, combine egg whites, corn syrup, sugar and coconut liquid in top of double boiler. Beat with electric mixer for about 1 minute, until well mixed. Place over boiling water. Cook for 7 minutes, beating continuously with electric mixer. Frosting should be thick and glossy. Remove from heat and stir in

Spread frosting on one cooled cake layer and sprinkle generously with grated coconut. Repeat with second and third layers. Spread frosting around sides of cake and cover with coconut.

SWEET POTATO PIE

3 cups mashed cooked sweet polatoca

14 pound (I stick) butter OR margarine, softened at room temperature % cup sugar

% cup firmly packed light brown

% teaspoon grated nutmeg 1 (9-inch) pie crust, unbaked

Make crust by cutting shortening into flour until mixture resembles coarse commeal. Gradually add ice water until mixture clings together and can be formed into a ball. Divide dough in half. Roll each half to square large enough to fit 8x8x4-inch casscrole dish or deep pan.

For filling, put 3 cups of peaches

and I cup of water in casserole or pan. Combine sugar with flour and cinnamon. Stir to mix. Sprinkle half of this mixture over peaches in baking dish. Dot with half the butter. Cover with one square of dough. Make 2 or 5 slits in crust to allow steam to escape while baking. Bake for about 15 minutes, or until crust

no longer looks "doughy." Top with remaining 3 cups peaches, ¼ cup water, 1 cup sugar mixture and 6 tablespoons butter. Place remaining square of dough over top. Cut several small slits in top

crust. If you like a buttery crust, brush top with melted butter before baking. Bake for 40 to 45 minutes or until top crust is lightly browned and filling is slightly thickened.

BREAD PUDDING WITH BOURBON SAUCE

4 tablespoons butter OR margarine

6 cups coarsely crumbled French

1 quart milk

cup raisins 2 eggs

l cup sugar

1 tablespoon vanilia extract Easy Bourbon Sauce: 1/2 pound (1 stick) butter OR mar-

garine, softened at room temperature 1 cup sugar

Yields 8 to 10 servings. Prehjeat oven to 350 F. Melt butter

Sauce can be reheated, but do so over very low heat and do not allow mixture to boil.

their liking, such as the Marbled Mousse, Individual Chocolate Souffles with coffee cream and the Chocolate Box with berries and cream that features direction in how to make a chocolate box.

And the section on decorative pie edges shows how to spice up an ordinary pie recipe by making fancy fluted edges, leaf edges, ruffled or braided

Pour the syllabub into individual glasses, spooning the curd on top, and put a spoonful of whipped cream on each serving.

LEMON POTATO PIE

- 1 medium unpecled boiling potato
- 1 lemon
- l cup sugar
- 1 cup water

2 pie crusts

Grate one medium unpeeled boiling potato. Grate one lemon, peel and all, saving the juice that runs off. Remove seeds.

Mix potato, lemon, sugar and water. Pour into a pie crust and put top crust in place. Bake in a hot (about 375 degree) oven until done. At the Firestone Farm they insert a

knife to test for doneness. When it's thick enough to cling to the knife, it's done. Keep in mind that baking wasn't an exact science in the 1880s. The stoves didn't have thermometers, so cooks relied on instinct and experience.

AUNT KATE'S COOKIES

- 2 cups molasses
- 1 cup brown sugar
- % cup lard or shortening

- 1 teaspoon ginger
- teaspoon cinnamon
- 2 teaspoons baking soda dissolved in 1 cup warm water
 - 2 eggs
 - 6 cups flour

In large bowl, combine brown sugar and lard or shortening. Mix until creamy. Stir in eggs and molasses. Add dry ingredients, alternating with warm water/soda mixture.

Mix until smooth. Drop by teaspoonfuls onto greased baking sheets and bake in a 400 degree oven for about 10 minutes. Note: these cookies are enhanced by a touch of butter icing.

GOOSEBERRY FOOL 1 quart ripe gooseberries, strawberries.

blackberries, or raspberries l cup sugar 1% cups grated lemon rind

1% cups heavy cream % cup crumbled macaroons

Combine the berries with 1/2 cup water in a saucepan. Cook over a low heat until fruit is extremely tender. Remove from heat and work through a sieve to make a smooth puree. While hot, stir in sugar and lemon rind. Set aside to cool. Whip cream until it holds a shape, then fold into the cool fruit puree.

Spoon into a serving bowl, sprinkle with macaroon crumbs, and chill thoroughly.

The author of "Little Women" was so fond

of the New England dessert called slump that she named her house in Concord, Mass. *Apple Slump.

LOUISA MAY ALCOTT'S APPLE SLUMP

- 6 cups apples, pared, cored and sliced
- 1 cup sugar 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- % cup water
- 1% cups sifted all-purpose flour % teaspoon sait
- 1% teaspoons baking powder
- % cup milk

Combine apple slices, sugar, cinnamon, and water in a saucepan with a tight-fitting lid. Heat to the boiling point. Sift together flour, salt, and baking powder. Stir in enough milk to make a soft dough.

Drop dough from a tablespoon onto apple mixture. Cover tightly and cook over a low heat for 30 minutes. Serve warm with New England Nutmeg Sauce, or rich cream.

This dessert can be made with various berries as well.

NEW ENGLAND NUTMEG SAUCE

- 1 cup sugar
- tablespoon flour
- 1 cup boiling water
- 1 tablespoon butter 1 teaspoon nutmeg

Mix together sugar and flour. Stir in boiling water and cook, stirring constantly, until lemon and beat.

Fox's 'Danger Theatre' not for all tastes... and proud of it

James Thurber once wrote a story about his favorite party pastime, a word game called Ghosts. His wife, however, did not share Thurber's giddy enthusiasm for the game, he noted, and "wished it were in hell with Knock, Knock, Who's There?"

It's hard to find a clear consensus on anything. From traditionally taboo topics such as politics and religion to unexpected hornets' nests like fantasy Super Bowls and "Well, I wouldn't call that green in a million years," only one bet is safe: people will disagree.

Television is no exception. Even though producers do costly research to find the lowest common denominators and safest (i.e., blandest) on-camera personalities, likes and dislikes on television are hotly debated. Want to polarize a party? Lament the passing of "Twin Peaks." Longing to irritate a newshound? Opine that venerable David Brinkley doesn't know Bosnia from Bosco, then stand back and let the games begin.

Now careening into the fray is Fox's new "Danger Theatre," premiering Sunday, July 11, and this one's sure to register high on the argument meter.

Some will see it as a vigorous spoof of bygone cop/adventure/dogooder shows such as "Knight Rider" and "Hawaii Five-O," programs filled with square-jawed heroes, beady-eyed villains and deathless dialogue such as "Not so fast, pal!" and "Book him!" Detractors, however, will quickly

peg the series as just another dumb sitcom, indistinguishable from, or even worse than the shows it aims to parody.

Robert Vaughn ("The Man From U.N.C.L.E.," "Superman III") brings his usual stolid, gray-at-the-temples authority to his duties as host of the series. Each week, Vaughn babbles ominously about the mean streets of contemporary America, the hooded gunmen lurking at every door and the helpless plight of peace-loving citizens scared to death by the may hem they see around them. He also makes periodic gaffes, such as solemnly intoning "crimes of fashion" for "crimes of passion" (a cue-card error), or eagerly inquiring about the post-show party when the episode is only half over.

Vaughn's gloomy pronouncements serve as introductions for each week's installments of two miniature series: First up is "The Searcher," starring Diedrich Bader as the leather-clad, motorcycleriding title character. Endowed with an impossibly deep, gravelly voice and a clumsiness normally reserved for animated characters, our hero stumbles through his macho paces, more or less saving the day but never getting the girl.

"Tropical Punch," the second of the show's recurring story lines, stars Adam West ("Batman") as stumbling, stout-hearted Mike Morgan, a captain on the police force of a crime-ridden Hawaiian city. Aided by his assistants, Detective Tom McCormick (sort of a blow-dried Barney Fife, played by Billy Morrissette), and rotund Al

Hamoki (Peter Navy Tuiasosopo), Morgan blusters his way through solving crimes, relentlessly drawing his gun and spouting an endless litany of tough-guy nonsense. These guys make "Police Squad" look like Interpol.

"Danger Theatre" is the brainchild of director Penelope Spheeris ("Wayne's World," the upcoming "Beverly Hillbillies") and Robert Wolterstorff of "Quantum Leap." Besides her duties as executive producer, Spheeris also directs several episodes.

So what's the verdict on "Danger Theater?" Is it a keen-eyed, ontarget spoof of by-the-numbers action shows, or a numbing halfhour of real stupidity, a no-brainer that makes "Mannix" seem like "Masterpiece Theatre?"

Here's the rub: it's both. For fans of "Airplane" and the "Hot Shots" movies the show will likely be a pallid but pleasing imitation. But viewers more inclined to PBS than "Police Squad" will find themselves quickly scurrying to another channel.
