Twp. to pay for road program, bill the county

Northville Township Trustees will bite the dust and pay for two palliative road treatments this year, but they expect Wayne County to reimburse them for the \$40,000 expense.

Trustees voted Thursday night 5-2 to pay for two treatments and then 6-1 to bill the county for the expense of doing it.

Gravel road residents at the meeting applauded the board's decision to pay for two calcium chloride treatments and then grilled the two trustees who voted against the motion.

Trustee Mark Abbo and Treasurer Rick Engelland were on the defensive after being asked by a resident to state their reasons for voting no. Both said they opposed the township paying the bill to treat roads that are owned by Wayne County. Abbo also opposed expending general fund tax dollars to pay an expense that benefits a small portion of township residents.

"My concern is that general fund money should be used for general fund purposes and not used to benefit a small portion of the community," Abbo said.

The trustee also objected to it because he says Wayne County collects tax dollars from township residents that are earmarked for municipal services. Those services include road maintenance, but Abbo said county officials haven't coughed up those dollars to treat the roads.

"There is money collected to take care of the dirt roads, but it (the money) is being taken care of by Wayne County," Abbo said.

Engelland agreed with Abbo and said the expenditure would create a hardship for the township.

"It is not a township responsibility. It's a county responsibility," the treasurer said. "As treasurer, I think (by approving this motion) we've put us (the township) in the hole about \$40,000."

"I consider that a lot of money. It's not chump change to me," Engelland said.

Township Supervisor Karen Baja made the motion to pay for the treatments. She sought board members' support even though the motion contradicted a tentative agreement trustees reached with gravel road residents earlier this year.

Board members agreed earlier this year to allocate the money for two treatments if dirt road residents devised a permanent solution to the yearly dust and dirt problem. Affected residents failed to reach a consensus even after Baja formed a committee to study the issue and held a public meeting on June 23 to address it.

More than 450 residents showed up at the meeting in the high school auditorium to debate the fairness of assessing residents for paving or treating the roads or forcing the county or township to absorb the

Speakers want pay-to-play dropped

Pay-to-play and the student assistance program were the two public school programs most mentioned by audience members at a public hearing before the Northville Board of Education Thursday night.

The hearing was held so residents could give their input on prioritization of programs to be restored once the budget is established.

Although the board adopted its general fund budget at its June 28 meeting, members are holding off on replacing any programs until they hear news on the state School Aid Act. School officials fear once they implement the programs, legislators will announce a cut in aid to local districts leaving them right where they started.

Supt. Leonard Rezmierski said three years ago that same thing happened when Lansing cut \$1.1 million from school state aid, hitting Northville particularly hard. Two years ago, it happened again when lawmakers cut the budget by \$125,000.

"We have two days of fund equity," he said. "That means we could keep our doors open for two days. That's close to the razor's edge. . . . We're just faced with the final results from Lansing."

Rezmierski said it could be late August or September before the specifics of the state School Aid Act will be decided, as the state isn't required to approve its budget until Oct. 1. School districts are required to have their balanced budgets passed by July 1.

At Thursday's hearing, residents mentioned several programs they would like the district to bring back. Linda Jo Hare was the first to address the board, asking that it implement a resource teacher for the middle school ALPS (Alternative Learning Program for Students). The program was cancelled following last year's

millage defeat.

"We need an advocate at the middle school level for our academically talented students," Hare said.

Approximately a dozen people stood up in support of the student assistance program, including several high school students, following a speech by Roxanne Casterline.

"I implore all of you — you can't teach students who are stoned, who are drunk, who are so stressed out — I implore to all of you that we need to keep (this program)," she said. "It has saved lives."

Charlie Stilec, the director of the program, said though his hours were reduced due to the defeat of last year's millage, it didn't mean the kids' problems were.

"This is not a community apart of

drug and alcohol problems," he said.

"We have a large problem with alcohol and drugs," said Allison Farmer, a 1993 Northville High School graduate. "There needs to be a full-time program. A lot of people don't realize what's going on, and they should realize it."

Laurie Marrs, executive director of the Northville Chamber of Commerce, asked the board to consider continuing the business education partnership program.

"Boy, that is a hard act to follow," she said, referring to the students who spoke before her about the student assistance program.

Marrs asked the board to match a grant to fund the program which involved over 400 students this year.

Several people in the audience

spoke up about eliminating the pay-to-participate athletic and co-curricular programs.

Mike Eckerly asked the board if it couldn't eliminate pay-to-play, then to at least reduce the cost of participation by 50 percent. Last year it cost a high school student \$195 to participate in athletics and \$100 for co-curricular activities while middle school students were required to pay \$108 for athletics and \$25 for co-curricular programs.

"The only positive statement (about pay-to-play) I can get out of the coaches is that it's an alternative to not having a program," athletic director Dennis Colligan said.

About 1,100 students participated

Officials face priorities quandary

The Northville Board of Education will not be able to bring back all the programs it put on a priority consideration list. The total package would represent a \$1,367,131 bill.

Based on a 3-percent assessment cap, the board figures it will have \$430,082 in its general fund budget with which to work. How, or if, the state School Aid Act, expected to be acted upon by legislators sometime before September, will affect that figure is not known.

"That (\$430,082) is with a giant question mark," Supt. Leonard Rezmierski said.

The state could require districts to pay solely for their own social security and retirement plans, and there is uncertainty over the property tax issue. School officials are still waiting to see if there will be a freeze or a cap on tax assessments.

"We certainly wished we had a fi-

nal budget," board vice president Glenna Davis told people in attendance at a public hearing Thursday night. "We wished we knew how much money the state would give us so we could get back more quickly with you."

Davis was referring to what programs the district will bring back once it does hammer down the budget. The majority of Thursday night's audience were in support of the student assistance program and the elimination of pay-to-participate athletics and co-curricular activities.

The student assistance program would cost the district \$25,000. Charlie Stilec oversees the program which counsels students in everything from substance and alcohol abuse to eating disorders.

Stilec told board members that this year he had been meeting once a week with social workers, counselors, special education teachers, administrators and psychologists.

"We discussed 178 kids . . . from

drugs and child abuse to attendance," he said. "I would hope to see (those meetings) continue."

As far as athletics are concerned, it would cost the district \$236,000 to eliminate the current pay-to-participate program.

Of that \$236,000, the cost of co-curricular activities makes up \$62,400.

A monitoring committee of the pay-to-participate program last week submitted its final report to the board with four possible recommendations: 1) eliminate pay-to-play; 2) keep pay-to-play, charging students the same fees as last year; 3) keep pay-to-play and increase the fees; or 4) offer no program at all.

Other items on the budget priority list, and the price to operate them, include:

● Restore 15 resource teachers for science, math, technology and gifted programs: \$61,500

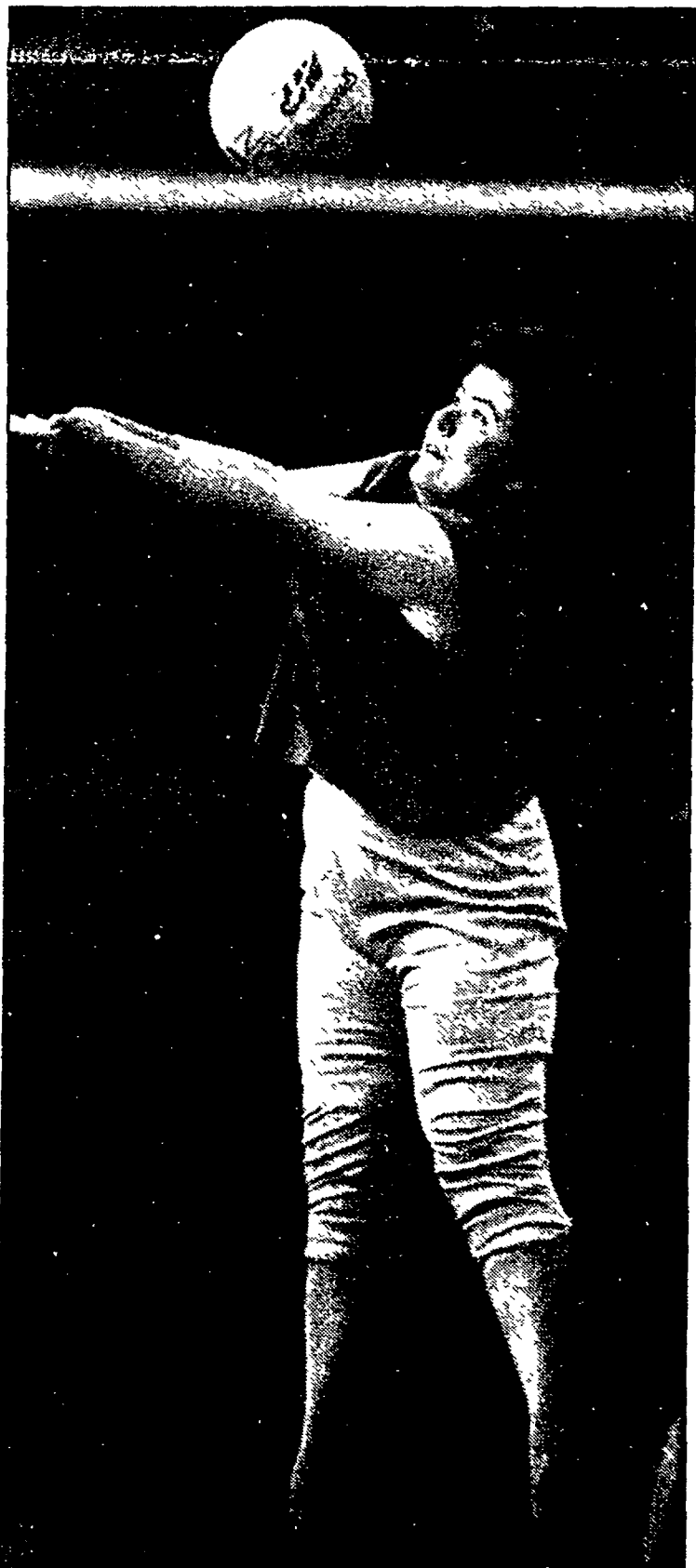

City considers reinstating Fourth of July fireworks

It's been two years now since the rockets' red glare has illuminated a Northville Fourth, but next year's revelers may be bathed in their glow.

While praising this year's Independence Day celebrations, the Northville City Council last week agreed to consider funding fireworks next year. Council members said several residents have commented on the lack of a fireworks display.

For years, the fireworks were funded in part by matching contributions from city and township coffers. In 1991, the 30-year tradition of

Fourth of July fireworks was almost snuffed out when Northville Township turned down a \$2,625 funding request from fireworks and parade organizers, citing liability concerns, and only authorized a \$500 contribution to the parade alone.

But an aggressive fund-raising campaign by the West Side Chapter of the Michigan Military Family Support Group raised the needed funds.

The tradition came to an end last year when the city withdrew its annual contribution of money and municipal services, citing austerity measures stemming from a \$1 mil-

costs. After two hours of discussion, residents failed to reach a solution.

Nonetheless, Baja said the meeting proved "very helpful and very beneficial," but failed to meet the conditions of the agreement trustees and residents reached earlier.

That's why Baja was asking board members to reconsider their agreement and vote in favor of treating the

roads.

"For the health, safety and public welfare we need to treat the roads," Baja said. "And what we need to do is take away the clause that says the board will pay if residents find a permanent solution and instead say when we find a permanent solution."

About 35 residents came to Thursday's meeting to hear the board's decision.

Patty Wong of Maxwell said she in-

vited Wayne County Executive Ed McNamara to come to the township and see how bad the dirt and dust problem had gotten this summer. After several unsuccessful attempts to reach him via telephone, she finally got word to him through the mail.

"I contacted him by mail and told him to come out and taste the dust out here," she said. She said she heard back from McNamara's office that he wasn't available, but other

representatives would be willing to come and meet with township officials and residents. That meeting was shelved once county officials heard trustees would be voting Thursday to treat the roads.

Wong urged the board to follow through on the county's offer to meet with them and talk about the dust and dirt problems. She also asked the board to explore other sources of revenue that might be used to help

defray road maintenance expenses to the township.

One such avenue would be the franchise fee township residents pay as cable television subscribers, Wong said.

"The newsletter that comes in my Omnicon bill says that the franchise fees that we pay go back into the community to be used at the discretion of the township," she said. "It amounts to 3 percent of our bill. That's about

\$4,500 a month and \$54,000 a year."

Wong said she asked Township Manager Bill Richards to track down those revenues and see if they could be used in the future.

Richards said he did some checking and found out that those funds are deposited into the township's general fund.

Baja said the township would explore all of its options in an effort to reduce the burden on its budget.

ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 188 OF THE MULTI-CHANNEL SERVICE PROVIDERS REGULATORY ORDINANCE

The City of Northville ordains:

Section 1. Amendment. Section 188 of the Northville Multi-Channel Service Providers Regulatory Ordinance adopted by the City Council on September 21, 1992 is hereby amended to read as follows:

B. The City Council/franchising authority, to the extent permitted by Section 623 of the CCPA (codified at USC 543), retains the power to approve the rates or charges associated with the providing of multi-channel service classified as cable service by an MCS provider classified as a cable operator. In regulating these rates or charges, the Council/franchising authority will follow the relevant regulations adopted by the Federal Communications Commission. In any rate proceeding all interested parties will be provided an opportunity to be heard and adequate public notice will be given.

Section 2. Effective Date, Publication and Filing. In accordance with City Charter, Chapter 7, Section 7.3, this ordinance shall become effective within ten days of enactment following publication in the Northville Record.

Fan allegedly threatens umpire

The parent of a Novi teen called township police Thursday, July 1, to say her son was threatened by a 17-year-old Northville boy. The woman said her son was yelled at after a fan was unhappy with the way he umpired a softball game. The woman said the Northville boy shouted obscenities at her son and then tugged at the collar of his shirt. Township police called the boy in for questioning. He admitted there had been an altercation but said his synopsis of the situation was different from the woman's. Police say the two have agreed to work out the problem between themselves.

OBSTRUCTION OF JUSTICE: Township police arrested a 19-year-old man on Saturday, July 3, for obstructing police in the line of duty.

Police say they responded to a resident's complaint that there were solicitors in the Winchester and Dundalk area. When they arrived, they found the man walking north on Winchester. The woman said she was in her home when she heard shots fired from what she believed to be a pellet gun. Inadequate water supply snags OIS development

Northville Township's newest industrial resident leaped over its first speed bump en route to its new home at Five Mile and Sheldon Road.

Troy-based Optical Imaging Systems (OIS) may have gotten a green light to move here under a tax abatement, but progress on its \$100 million, 85,000-square-foot development has been halted by a less than adequate water supply to its site.

Township Supervisor Karen Baja told trustees Thursday an engineer's report revealed that water flow test-

ing at the site came up short by 3,500 gallons per minute. Baja said OIS needs at least 4,000 gallons per minute to support its manufacturing facility, but the engineer's report shows flows are kicking out only 500 gallons per minute.

"We can't allow building to go forward," she said.

Baja said the township needs to lay 5,000 feet of water line to create a water loop to Six Mile to support the OIS development and others that may spring up there in the future. She said the water loop is part of the township's master utilities plan, but is needed now sooner than

anticipated.

Trustees voted 5-2 to extend to the water line and create the loop at a cost of \$473,000. The money, Baja said, would have to come from the Water and Sewer Department's restricted fund.

Treasurer Rick Engelland and Trustee Barbara O'Brien voted against the motion because even though trustees talked about methods to recover the money under a special assessment plan, there were no guarantees if or when the township would ever be paid back.

Baja said OIS and township officials detected the water shortfall only

after OIS began preparing blueprints for township planners' approval.

"This came up because OIS is coming in for site plan approval and they need water," Baja said. "This is something that is necessary for us to do."

Company officials have requested a special meeting with planning commissioners this Thursday for preliminary and final site plan approval for its high-tech manufacturing facility. The facility is expected to produce about 50,000 flat-panel displays for commercial and military aircraft.

Township Planning and Zoning Administrator Carol Maise said plans have to reflect that water and sewer

utilities are able to service the site before OIS wins commissioners' approval. Trustees will have no say in site plan approval, Maise said.

Trustees seemed hesitant to approve the expense until they had Baja's assurance that the \$473,000 would be returned to the township under a special assessment or other means of reimbursement from the benefitting property owners.

That would mean the township would have to assess OIS and Wayne County because they are the only property owners now who would benefit from the extended water line.

Engelland and Baja both had their

doubts that Wayne County would be interested in participating in a special assessment plan.

"No, the county isn't going to be willing to participate in a SAD (special assessment district)," Baja said with a terse response to Engelland's query about the county's willingness to pay a portion of the \$473,000 cost of extending the line.

Trustee Mark Abbo said he would agree to approve the expenditure if existing and future property owners are assessed.

"I'm not opposed to it as long as the owner or future owners eventually pay it back," Abbo said.

In athletics last year with some families writing checks for as much as \$1,400 so their children could participate in sports and co-curricular activities, Colligan added.

Four residents said they were disappointed because they thought the district misrepresented itself during election time.

"I feel like I've been lied to," remarked one parent who said she was urged to vote for the millage so pay-to-play would be eliminated.

"We tried to be as straightforward as possible prior to the election," board treasurer Robert McMahon said, as he read over the millage campaign material sent out by the district.

"There has never been a guarantee," Rezmierski said.

The last person to address the board was Jan Purtell, who directs the business-education partnership program. After she gave a plug for her program, she asked the board to also consider bringing back a technology resource teacher, especially since William Hamilton, director of instruction, had resigned.

"I would like to see us support technology as much as we can," she said. "I think it's valuable for students to prepare for employment and the future."

Vice president Glenna Davis, who presided over Thursday's public hearing, told the audience they were preaching to the converted.

"Obviously all these things you all

are lobbying for are things we value," she said. "But we have to run a balanced budget."

Davis added the board would do its best in prioritizing programs.

"We are listening," she said. "We are faced with a very, very difficult situation."

Eliminate pay-to-play, reinstate student help

Certain residents who spoke at the Northville Board of Education priorities meeting Thursday expressed a preference for eliminating the pay-to-play requirement for athletic participation and for reinstating full funding of the Student Assistance program.

We, too, see a need to assign high priority to both items and would like to offer an endorsement of these suggestions.

Concerning athletic and co-curricular activities, we feel it is hardly necessary to justify the position that such programs should be cost-free to the student. Sports and other non-academic functions traditionally have been regarded as basic curriculum staples and have been offered free-of-charge at public schools. Any move to impose a fee for such activities should be viewed as a stop-gap measure to be discontinued at the earliest opportunity. Passage of the June 14 millage presented the district with such an opportunity.

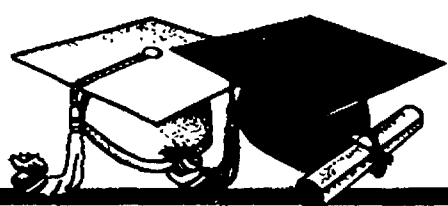
It should not be necessary to state a full case for the importance of athletics and co-curricular programs to young people. Suffice it to say that schools are not — nor have they ever been — places for academic learning only. Indeed, children attend schools to learn crucial life and social skills like team work, cooperation, goal setting and dealing with disappointment, and the playing field often provides the best setting for lasting experiences of that kind.

During the 1992-93 school year, many parents were forced to pay hundreds of dollars to permit their children to participate in athletics and co-curricular activities and that is asking too much of homeowners who already shoulder a difficult tax burden to support the local schools.

We think pay-to-play should be eliminated beginning in September.

The reinstatement of full funding for the Student Assistance program is another item we believe should be given top priority.

As a result of last year's failed millage increase request, the hours of the Student Assistance coordinator were cut back from five to two days a week at the beginning of the 1992-93 year. It wasn't until late in the year that funding was

found to keep the coordinator on staff for a third day each week.

The dangers of drug and alcohol abuse can hardly be overestimated, and the recent Alcohol and Other Drugs survey indicated how widespread the problem is, even in a district as praiseworthy as Northville. During the 1991-92 school year, the last year of complete funding for the program, Student Assistance received no fewer than 470 referrals.

But Student Assistance is not limited to helping students who have chemical dependency problems. It offers several problem resolution groups, including ones dealing with eating disorders, stress, grief and loss, substance abuse risk, and divorce.

School district officials have many difficult decisions to make in weeding out programs for which the current financial crunch won't permit funding. With an uncertain financial future due to pending changes at the state level, they have wisely taken a conservative approach and assumed the imposition of a 3-percent property assessment cap for the coming year. Such a ceiling is a likelihood in the aftermath of Proposal A's defeat June 2.

Regardless of where the budget axe comes down, some worthwhile programs are going to be eliminated from the fiscal 1993-94 budget. Disappointments should be expected from the no-win situation.

We trust that school officials will think long and hard before arriving at their final list of priorities and we hope that when they do, athletics and co-curricular activities will once again be cost free and the Student Assistance program will be returned to full funding.

Formula produces mediocrity

I wasn't exactly sure what it meant until it directly affected my social plans. I'd forgotten which restaurant I was supposed to meet my friends in, and could find nothing about any of them that would jog my memory.

Therein lay the rub. Bannigan-ization refers to the process by which corporate America seizes on a colorful concept (in this case, the neighborhood bar and grill), completely strips it of all character, sterilizes it, and mass-produces it. (And if you don't think the neighborhood bar and grill is colorful, you haven't spent enough time at the Starting Gate or the Wagon Wheel in Northville). Restaurants are unfortunately the most vulnerable to this kind of treatment.

Reinforcing the move toward Bannigan-ization is the theory that Americans want someplace to eat and drink that's "safe." The idea is that you can go into any restaurant in the chain, from Ashtabula, Ohio, to Tucuman, New Mexico, and the menu will be the same, the decor will look the same, the food will taste the same, and the restrooms will be in the

same place with the same number of urinals. And I suppose to some extent, the corporate clone-makers are right. There exists a large portion of our population which doesn't care what kind of food it consumes. Just open up the chute and dump it in, and forget about things like flavor and care and uniqueness in preparation.

The reason I raise this issue now is the erection of the new Grady's at the Novi Town Center. I haven't seen the place on the inside, or the menu, but already I'm skeptical. I was in Denver a couple of weeks ago and saw another Grady's, and by God it was identical.

My worst fear is that, like my friends who put Escorts on the streets, somewhere, somebody is cranking out chain restaurants like Grady's on some insane assembly line, to compete with those bland brethren, Friday's and Bannigan's.

Some on the Novi City Council have said the city could become the "restaurant row" of the western suburbs. If that happens, though, I hope it's not built on a backbone of chain restaurants.

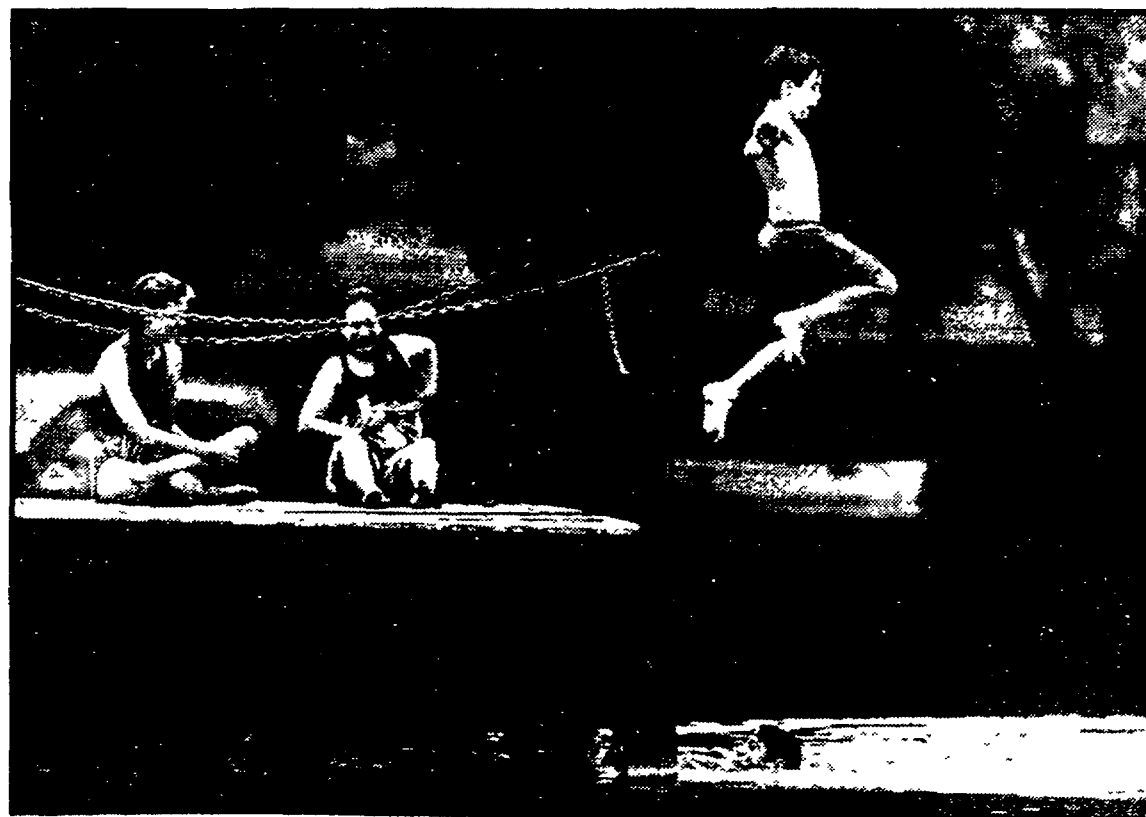
Let's hope our restaurant row is chock full of places like Maisano's, where Frank Maisano makes his own sausages on the premises. Or Home Sweet Home, where, even though the silverware all matches these days, they're putting old favorites like meat loaf on the plate with a '90s flair. Or Diamond Jim Brady's (Brady's? Grady's? The similarity disturbs me. Please, let's never confuse the two.), where Chef Mary Brady can do more things with salmon than your mother could with hamburger.

When it comes to restaurants, to borrow a line, quality should be job one.

Opinions from the twin cities

Comments, reactions and observations from across the twin cities — that's Northville and Novi, of course.

Actually, Northville and Novi are about as much twin cities as Danny DeVito and Arnold Schwarzenegger were twins in the movie of the same name. As a former Northville Record reporter once said: "If Novi had a town clock it would be digital."

ITEM FIRST: Received a nice letter from Karen Bartley Slack and Susan Boyd MacGonigal regarding my column a couple of weeks ago about the evolution of Main Street USA, particularly as it applies to Northville.

Slack and MacGonigal are the owners of Traditions (by Bartley and Boyd, Inc.) on Center Street in Northville.

They wrote: "As business owners, and actually the first occupants of the renovated Schrader (Furniture) building, we strongly feel there is a future for retail in the downtowns of cities such as Northville."

"Quality and selection of merchandise, personal service, along with the ability to customize orders for our customers, sets Traditions and many downtown retailers apart from the 'one-stop shops' and large department stores."

They went on to suggest that perhaps the Chamber of Commerce could create a division with the sole purpose of focusing on the retailers in the downtown area.

"Attracting new businesses to fill in the gaps, marketing our uniqueness as a community, and cohesively working on our businesses to better serve this community are vital to surviving the inevitable changes in downtown Northville," they concluded.

I agree and have notified Laurie Marrs, executive director of the Northville Chamber, that I would be happy to do what I can to help get things moving. This really isn't fair to Laurie because it puts the ball in her court, but I do believe it's a worthwhile cause.

All citizens, I believe, have a vested interest in the viability of its Main Street. Perhaps more than anything else, communities gain their identities from the quality of their Main Streets.

ITEM SECOND: My long-awaited opportunity to debate the topic of grade inflation took place last Thursday when I did lunch with Novi High School Principal Art Miller and Assistant Principal Chuck Nanas.

Needless to say, nothing was resolved. That's one of the problems with topics like grade inflation — there are interesting arguments to be made on both sides.

They did give me a warning, however. They said if I thought the seven or eight valedictorians they had this year was a lot, I was going to have a field day when 1994 comes around. Seems like 14 or 15 Novi High School juniors are carrying perfect 4.0 grade point averages into their senior years.

There was also some good news. Miller said my comments about grade inflation would be distributed to high school teachers at the start of the 1993-94 academic year and become the topic for some discussion.

"These are good and interesting things to be talking about," he said. "As long as we're discussing the issues, it's a positive process."

That's an enlightened and encouraging viewpoint from the high school principal in a school district with a school board which apparently doesn't like to hear dissenting opinions.

Rhone grapes yield success in California

California wineries have experienced success with production of wines from grape varieties indigenous to France's Rhone Valley.

About 10 years ago, the lead was taken by head "Rhone Ranger" Bonny Doon Vineyard's creative winemaker Randall Grahm. Today, in California, from northern Sonoma County south to Santa Barbara, winemakers have charted success on the course of Rhone varietal production and the Rhone Rangers are legion.

Among them is Michigan State University grad and St. Clair Shores native Doug Danielak, winemaker at Jade Mountain winery in northern Sonoma County. Danielak's ride into winemaking is circuitous, but interesting.

"My wife and I sort of hung out in Burgundy during our honeymoon in 1983," he said. Upon his return to the United States he sold wine for Detroit Metro area distributor Chip Delsener until the end of 1985 when he pulled up stakes to work and attend grapegrowing and winemaking school in Beaune, the heart of Burgundy. Fluency in French helped Danielak, although he was unable to land a job as winemaker for a Burgundy producer. Traditions ran too deep for this!

He returned to the U.S. in 1987 to work harvest at Saintsbury winery in California's Carneros region. In 1988, Jade Mountain winery needed a winemaker and Danielak was hired. In the last five years, he has engineered conversion of the winery's Cloverdale vineyards from riesling, sauvignon blanc and cabernet sauvignon to 31 acres of the Rhone varieties syrah, marsanne and a small percentage of mourvedre.

Jade Mountain's owner James Paras acquired a second property of 22 acres on Mount Veeder in Napa Valley and Danielak uprooted Bordeaux varieties and planted Rhone varieties — more syrah and mourvedre, plus vognier, grenache and cinsault.

Jade Mountain's first release of a Rhone-style wine was 1988, a varietal mourvedre made from purchased grapes. Today, Jade Mountain's wine portfolio includes a varietal mourvedre and syrah, two proprietary wines, La Provencale (a blend of Southern Rhone varieties) and Les Jumeaux (a blend of cabernet sauvignon and mourvedre sourced from 60-year-old vines). If your French isn't as strong as Danielak's, we'll explain that Les Jumeaux is translated as "the twins."

WINE SELECTIONS OF THE WEEK

- 1991 Quivira Zinfandel, Dry Creek Valley (\$13.25). A delicious rendition of an all-American wine with harmonized ripe berries, pepper, spice and fragrant oak.
- 1991 Merryvale Reserve Chardonnay (\$25). Lobster, smoked trout and grilled salmon are the suggested accompaniments for this Burgundy-like chardonnay boasting solid fruit, oak and buttery elements.
- 1990 Pine Ridge Selected Cuvee Merlot (\$15). A mixed grill of fish, eggplant, roasted peppers, lamb and game would nicely complement this power-packed merlot.
- 1990 Pine Ridge Rutherford Cuvee Cabernet Sauvignon (\$15) carries an earthy component with blackberry, black currant and great fruit extraction in an ageable style.
- Three Monticello wines impressed us with their flavor and value. The 1991 Monticello Chardonnay, Napa Valley (\$15) shows exuberant pear, apple and mango fruit in a wine where the barrel fermentation character complements rather than hides the fruit expression. For those who prefer toasty, vanilla-oak and a touch of butter along with fruit, the 1990 Monticello Corley Reserve Chardonnay (\$17.50) is the correct selection. 1989 Monticello Cabernet Sauvignon, Napa Valley (\$14) is highlighted by blackberry, bright cherry, spice, and oak with a fair amount of tannin.

AN EGGS-ACTING SCIENCE Omelets, frittatas require some technique

The smell of a sizzling omelet and its aromatic fillings could wake the laziest of late-risers. And since omelets can be filled with just about anything edible, these made-to-order egg dishes can please everybody at once. Hosts who know how hard that is to do appreciate that fact.

Perhaps it's this quality that makes it such a popular brunch or breakfast specialty; however, their great taste and quick prep time make omelets a good candidate for evening meals as well. Many families eat them so readily that they don't even notice last night's leftovers hidden inside.

Several types of egg dishes have come to be known as omelets. French folded omelets are mixed gently and cooked in a frenzy to perfection. Firmer or sweeter omelets are made by adding milk or sugar to the egg mixture before cooking. Some are even baked.

The most common American version is a take on the French folded omelet that is fluffier and more like a souffle than its European counterpart.

The Italian frittata usually has the fillings mixed into the eggs prior to cooking, as opposed to the folded omelet that has the fillings nested inside the eggs. It is often cooked in a larger pan, browned on both sides, and then cut into pie-like wedges to serve several people.

Fortunately, there are as many delicious types of fillings as there are people. Experiment with just about any type of meat, seafood, cheese, fresh vegetables and even fruit. Season them to taste, but be careful — many fillings (bacon, for example) taste fine without them.

If experimenting leaves too much to chance to suit you, take a peek at the California Culinary Academy's *Breakfasts & Brunches* cookbook. Recipes range from the basic egg omelet to creations featuring the hearty, crisp, creamy and sweet tastes of omelet art.

Mastering that art is certainly not as difficult as its reputation suggests, but turning out picture-perfect omelets can be tricky. Beginners shouldn't be afraid to try their hand as the rewards are well worth even a bungled effort.

Use several family breakfasts as omelet practice sessions before incorporating them into your entertaining menu. Throw in your family's favorite fillings and even less-than-perfect attempts won't be wasted.

Once you've got it down, impress guests with a fun and easy "omelet bar." Place a variety of diced meats, vegetables and grated cheese out on a counter top or table. Let guests choose their own fillings and spoon them into a bowl. Cook up individual omelets with the chosen fillings. This requires very little time — fillings can be prepared in advance, and each omelet takes only minutes to cook.

Because omelets cook so fast, make sure everything is in order before beginning. Have toast, fruit juice and other accompaniments on the table and the serving plates on hand. Then tell the diners to remain within earshot if they want theirs hot.

SECRETS OF SUCCESS

- Set the eggs and any refrigerated toppings out ahead of time so they can warm up to room temperature. This helps to keep the outside layer of the omelet from toughening up before the egg cooks through.
- Choose a skillet with a smooth surface so the eggs will slide over it and turn easily.
- As the egg mixture cooks along the bottom, carefully lift cooked portions at the edges and tilt the pan so that the uncooked egg runs underneath.
- After adding filling to the center of the omelet, loosen the omelet at the edges and fold over one third toward the middle.
- To make the final fold, tip the pan and slip the unfolded edge down and onto the serving plate. Use a spatula to flip the previously folded edge over and onto the plate.
- Be patient.

Perfectly folded omelets will come eventually. It is most important that the temperature of the pan and the butter be monitored carefully.

It must be just hot enough to grab and hold together the softer egg on top, but not so hot that it toughens up the bottom layer before the rest cooks.

BASIC OMELETS

- 9 eggs
- 3 tablespoons water
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- Pinch ground nutmeg

BRIE AND HAM OMELET

- ¼ pound Brie cheese
- 6 tablespoons butter or margarine
- 2 tablespoons chopped shallots or mild onion
- ¼ pound thinly sliced baked ham or black forest

- ham, julienned
- 2 tablespoons chopped parsley
- ¼ teaspoon dried tarragon
- Basic Omelets (see above)

Yields 3 to 4 servings.

Let cheese stand at room temperature for about 1 hour to soften. Scoop cheese from rind, discarding rind; set cheese aside.

In medium frying pan over moderate heat, melt 2 tablespoons of butter and cook shallots and ham, stirring occasionally until ham browns lightly and shallots are soft. Stir in parsley and tarragon. Keep warm while preparing omelets.

Prepare 3 or 4 basic omelets, cooking them in remaining butter. Spoon dollops of cheese over each, using ¼ or ½ of it. Then spoon ¼ or ½ of ham mixture over cheese on top of each omelet.

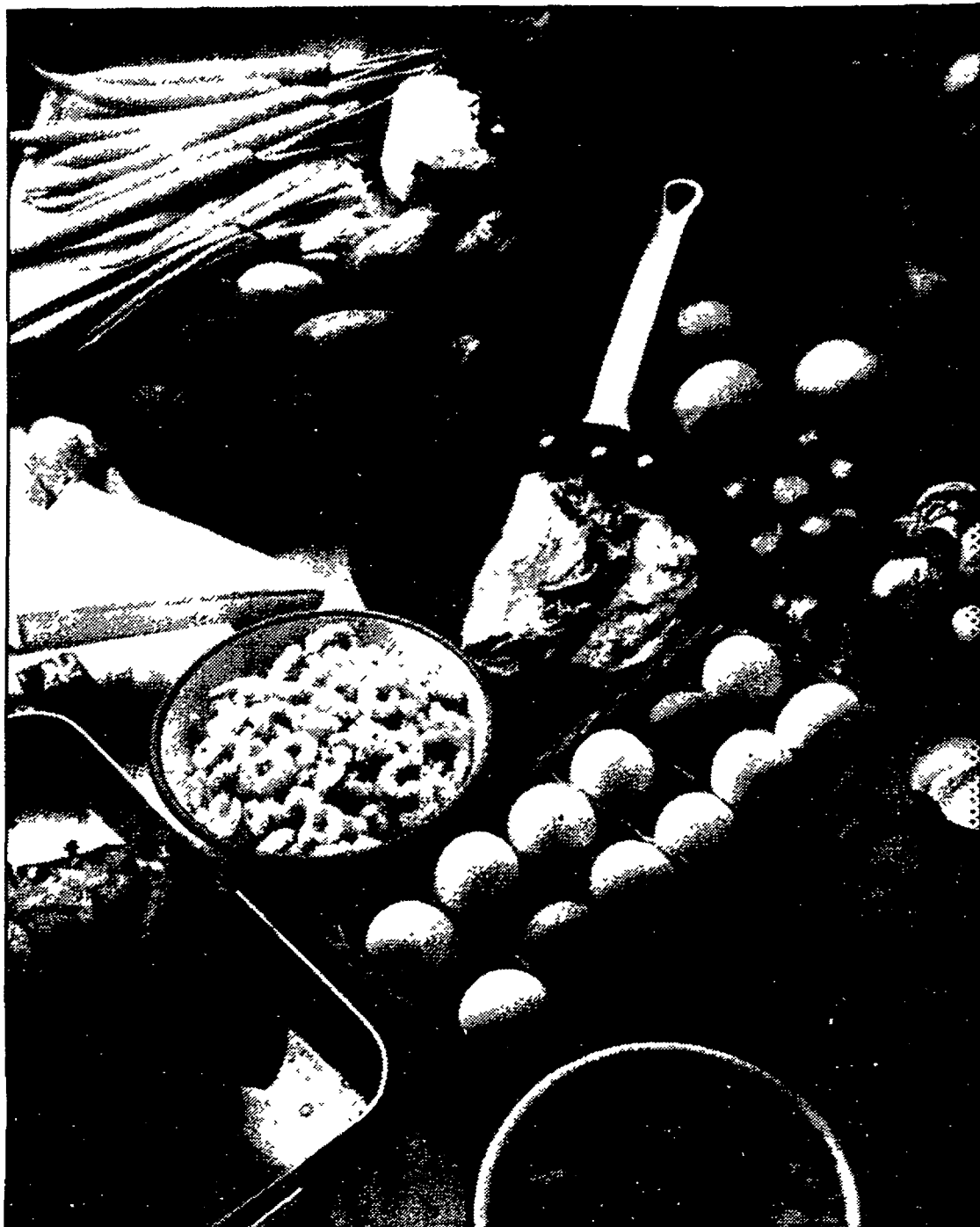
Fold as directed in Basic Omelets recipe and serve at once.

The filling for this omelet requires virtually no cooking — just warming through. The combination is delicious with sprouted wheat-bread toast.

SHRIMP AND AVOCADO OMELET

- 6 green onions, thinly sliced
- 6 tablespoons butter or margarine
- ¼ pound small peeled, cooked shrimp
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- Basic Omelets
- 1 medium avocado, peeled, seeded and diced
- 3 to 4 tablespoons sour cream

Yields 3 to 4 servings.



Fruits and vegetables, meat and seafood join with fresh eggs for delightful omelet.

- Pinch white pepper
- 3 to 4 tablespoons butter or margarine

Yields 3 or 4 individual omelets.

In large bowl, beat eggs with water, salt, nutmeg and white pepper until well blended (about 30 seconds).

For each omelet, heat about 1 tablespoon of butter in 8-inch omelet pan over medium-high heat until it begins to foam. Pour in ¼ to ½ of egg mixture.

At first, slide pan back and forth to keep omelet from sticking. As bottom begins to set, slip thin spatula under eggs, tilting pan and lifting cooked portion to let uncooked egg mixture flow under it to the center.

Repeat until most of omelet is set, but center and top are still moist and creamy.

For filled omelet, spoon filling across center in line with handle. Have warm serving plate ready.

Loosen one side of omelet with spatula and fold it about ½ over remainder.

Then hold pan over serving plate so other side begins to slide out. Flip omelet so that previously folded side folds over, producing an omelet folded in thirds with center third on top.

The warmth of a just-cooked omelet melts room-temperature Brie cheese so that its distinctive flavor spreads throughout; you won't need much of the cheese to fill several omelets. Accompany this brunch dish with a watercress and mushroom salad and a light red wine.

Omelets cook up sweet or spicy

In medium frying pan over moderate heat, cook onions in 2 tablespoons of butter until limp and bright green. Add shrimp and lemon juice, stirring just until shrimp are heated through. Keep warm.

Immediately prepare 3 or 4 Basic Omelets, cooking them in remaining butter. Use 1/2 or 3/4 of shrimp filling for each, then add 1/4 or 1/2 of avocado and a dollop of sour cream.

Fold as directed in Basic Omelets recipe and serve at once.

This delicate omelet is filled with fluffy cream cheese and brown sugar and covered with fresh strawberries and sliced almonds.

Accompany it with hot breakfast tea and warm brioches or toasted bagels.

STRAWBERRY BLINTZ OMELETS

- 1 baked (about 2 cups) strawberries
- 2 tablespoons vanilla sugar
- 1 (3-ounce) package cream cheese, softened
- 1 tablespoon milk or half-and-half
- Pinch ground nutmeg
- Basic Omelets
- 3 to 4 tablespoons light-brown

sugar

3 to 4 tablespoons toasted sliced almonds

Yields 3 to 4 servings.

Hull strawberries, reserving a few with leaves for garnish; cut hulled berries in halves.

Place in bowl, mix lightly with vanilla sugar, and let stand at room temperature while preparing filling and omelets.

In small bowl, beat cream cheese with milk and nutmeg until fluffy.

Prepare 3 or 4 Basic Omelets, omitting pepper from egg mixture. Use 1/2 or 3/4 of cream-cheese mixture and about 1 tablespoon of brown sugar to fill each. Fold omelets as directed. Serve omelets on warm plates, spooning strawberries over and sprinkling each with about 1 tablespoon almonds. Serve at once.

Frittata is the Italian word for omelet, but a frittata differs from our version of an omelet in several ways. A frittata can be made in a larger pan and cut in wedges to serve several people. Although omelets are usually served as soon as they are cooked, a frittata may be eaten hot, lukewarm or even cold. It is usually turned out before it has completed cooking, inverted, and returned to the

frying pan to brown on both sides. The filling for a frittata becomes part of the egg mixture.

This one, which in Italian is called frittata alla contadina, contains zucchini, carrots, herbs, onion and peas. You might serve it with grilled Italian sausages and a crusty loaf of whole-wheat bread.

COUNTRY VEGETABLE FRITTATA

- 1 medium zucchini
- 1 medium carrot, thinly sliced
- 8 eggs
- 3 tablespoons water
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- Dash pepper
- Dash ground nutmeg
- 2 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese
- 2 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese
- 2 tablespoons butter or margarine
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1/4 cup thinly sliced onion
- 2 tablespoons chopped parsley
- 1/4 cup thawed frozen peas

Yields 4 servings.

Cut zucchini into quarters, lengthwise; then cut crosswise into 1/4-inch thick slices. Cook carrot in small amount of boiling salted water (or steam on rack) until crisp-tender

(4 to 6 minutes), adding zucchini for last 2 minutes of cooking time. Drain vegetables well and set aside.

Beat eggs in large bowl with 3 tablespoons water, salt, pepper, nutmeg and cheese.

Melt butter with 1 tablespoon of olive oil in well-seasoned or non-stick 10- to 11-inch omelet pan over medium heat.

Mix in onion and cook until limp. Add garlic, oregano, parsley, peas and carrot mixture, stirring to coat with onions.

Pour egg mixture into pan and cook without stirring until about 1/2 inch around outer edge is set. With wide spatula, lift some of egg mixture from sides of pan, all the way around, tipping pan to let uncooked egg flow to pan bottom.

Continue cooking until eggs are almost set but top of center is still moist and creamy.

Invert a large, round, flat plate (a little larger than the frying pan) over pan. Holding plate and pan together, turn frittata out onto plate. Add remaining 1 tablespoons olive oil to pan, swirl to coat pan, then slide frittata from plate into pan.

Cook for 2 minutes to brown bottom. Cut in wedges.

Canned goods can't last forever

"Canned foods that are stored for several years may become very poor in quality and nutritional value," said Sylvia Treitman home economist for the Oakland County Cooperative Extension Service.

"Now is a good time to check the pantry shelves, to see what has been forgotten and is no longer good to keep."

Generally, canned goods have the best shelf life of one year stored in a cool dry area of about 67 degrees. The nutritional value of canned goods lessens with time, so it is wise to use canned goods

quickly and not keep them for many years.

"If you notice a bulging can, this is a definite sign of spoilage, and the can should be thrown away," said Treitman.

Make sure that it is safely disposed of so that no one else may accidentally find and use it. Any leaking, or badly dented, cans should also be thrown out. If you suspect that a can is bad, do not taste it; it could be very dangerous.

To use canned foods wisely here are some safety tips:

- Store canned foods in a clean dry place below

85 degrees — 67 degrees is ideal.

- Date canned goods when purchased and rotate supply, using oldest first.
- Never store canned goods near stoves, radiators or furnaces or areas where temperature goes over 100 degrees.
- Do not leave canned goods in car, camper or basement where temperatures may allow cans to freeze.

This innovation puts Jade Mountain in the annals of California wine history and gives California red blends a new definition. Danielak explains the twinning.

"When California cabernet sauvignon is picked at prime ripeness, it's lush, delicious and chocolatey," he says. "In Les Jumeaux, I try to express full cabernet sauvignon flavors with mourvedre softening the tannic impression." It works, because this wine is absolutely delicious.

Jade Mountain's production is min-

iscule compared to that of the industry's giants. They may not be available in every wine shop, but they are definitely worth searching out.

Jade Mountain Grenache (\$10) is not made each year. The current release was made from a blend of 1990 California and Washington State grapes. Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms regulations require that as such, it must be labeled "American" and may not be vintage dated. It is a perfect summer barbecue or picnic wine.

1991 La Provencale (\$13), a blend of syrah, mourvedre, grenache and

carignane, sports solid fruit and is delicious, full and round with a powerful finish. 1990 Les Jumeaux (\$13) has the distinct aroma of mourvedre with complementary peppery spice and black truffles making it complementary to red meat and heartier dishes.

Two versions of the 1990 Mourvedre (\$14) are available. One was filtered and the other was not. The label indicates the difference and they are slightly dissimilar when tasted.

Our preference is the unfiltered, which seems to showcase each char-

acteristic of the 60- to 120-year-old vines more intensely.

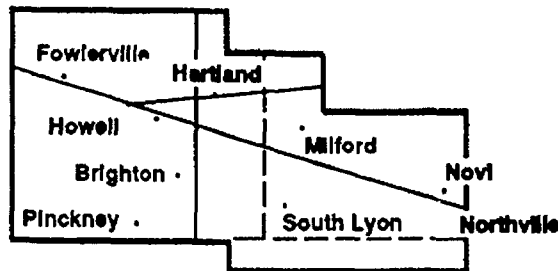

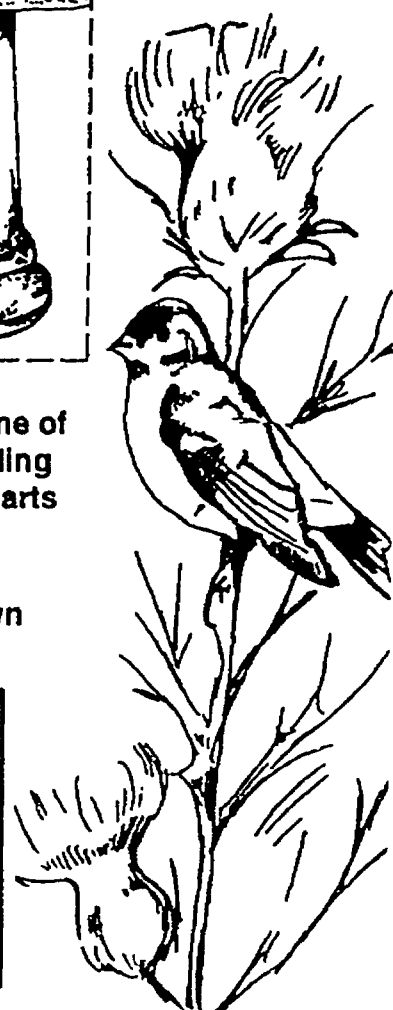

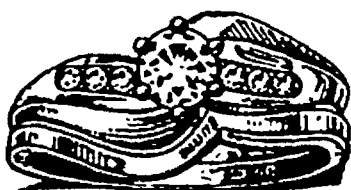

What cable was made for: Network TV hits summer slump

Though it is not so solemn as death or taxes, there is something inevitable about television: reruns. Viewers who've been attending night school or reading bedtime stories to freshly bathed children for the last few years may consider reruns a godsend, but to most of the nation's 95 million TV-owning households, they're a bore.

This summer seems especially bad. For the last few years, Fox has been proud to get out ahead of the fall-season pack with new episodes of "Beverly Hills, 90210," or even a new series — last summer it was "Melrose Place." But in the dog days of 1993, even once-cagey Fox has gone into hibernation.

The loss of "Late Night With David Letterman" is another blow. Sorry, night owls, Dave is in reruns on NBC until his reincarnation Aug. 30 on CBS.

Yes, the pickings are slim indeed. CBS has introduced a couple of summer series, of which "Johnny Bago," the saga of a Brooklynite on the lam in a recreational vehicle, is the best.

But things couldn't be so bad that

somebody would haul out an old Richard Chamberlain miniseries, could they? Think again.

On Sunday, July 18, ABC launches an encore presentation of "The Thorn Birds." It is the third time the network has aired the 10-hour 1983 miniseries, which has also been seen in syndication on local independent channels around the country.

For those who may not know, "The Thorn Birds" features Chamberlain as an ambitious, young Roman Catholic priest in Australia whose secret love for a beautiful woman (Rachel Ward) keeps things interesting for three generations. The production earned six Emmys, including one for Barbara Stanwyck, who played a strong-willed rancher reminiscent of her Wild West matriarch from "Big Valley" days. Earl Holliman, Ken Howard, Richard Kiley, Piper Laurie, Christopher Plummer, Jean Simmons and Mare Winningham also star.

ABC will use "The Thorn Birds" to fill the chinks in a thin summer schedule, airing the miniseries in a record six parts this week. To catch the whole soapy saga, viewers will

have to tune in (or set their VCRs) every night except Friday, July 23.

Ten years ago, when "The Thorn Birds" debuted, ratings were good. Since then, two things have changed — 60 percent of all homes have cable TV, and 70 percent have VCRs — and it will be interesting to see whether "The Thorn Birds" can score double-digit ratings against such hefty living-room competition.

Among the week's other choices are several made-for-cable movies. Showtime brings out "Chantilly Lace," a film by and about women, on Sunday. Jill Eikenberry, JoBeth Williams, Talia Shire and Ally Sheedy star as friends who come together for three reunions within a year's time. Also on Sunday, The Disney Channel brings out a new, four-hour adaptation of "Heidi," featuring Jason Robards as the grandfather, Jane Seymour as the governess and newcomer Noley Thornton in the title role. Filmed on location in the Austrian Alps, "Heidi" concludes Monday, July 19.

On Thursday, July 22, basic cable offers a choice of the first-run films. On Lifetime, Robert Urich reprises his "Spenser: For Hire" role in "Spenser: Ceremony." Avery Brooks ("Star Trek: Deep Space Nine") co-stars as Spenser's streetwise ally, Hawk. On the USA Network, Gregory Harrison plays a hunky yet struggling actor who finds a new love at work and \$10 million in his bank account in "Caught in the Act."

As for the networks, well, it's a good thing there's so much to do outdoors in the summertime.

Here comes the Festival

The reigning Miss Farmington/Farmington Hills said she's had a purpose. She wanted people to understand the plight of elderly peo-

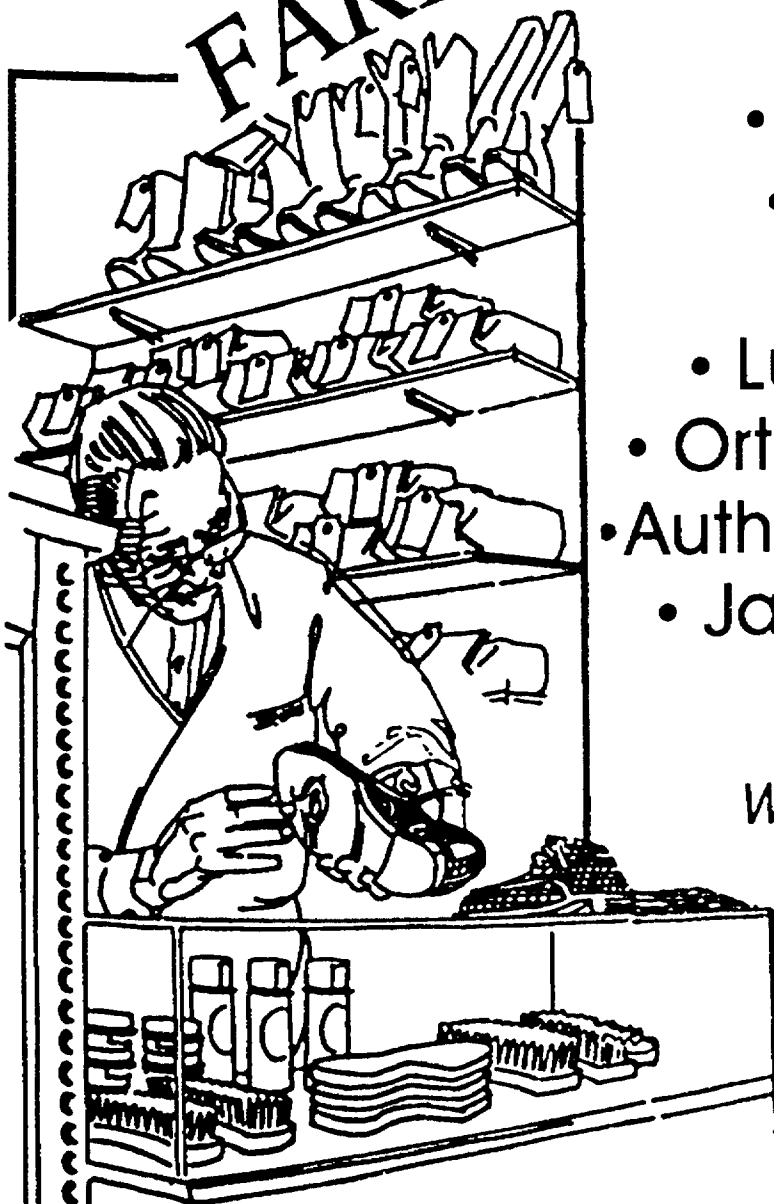

Planning, long hours and faithful dedication go into preparing the annual parade which has become a family favorite as well as the festival's most popular event.

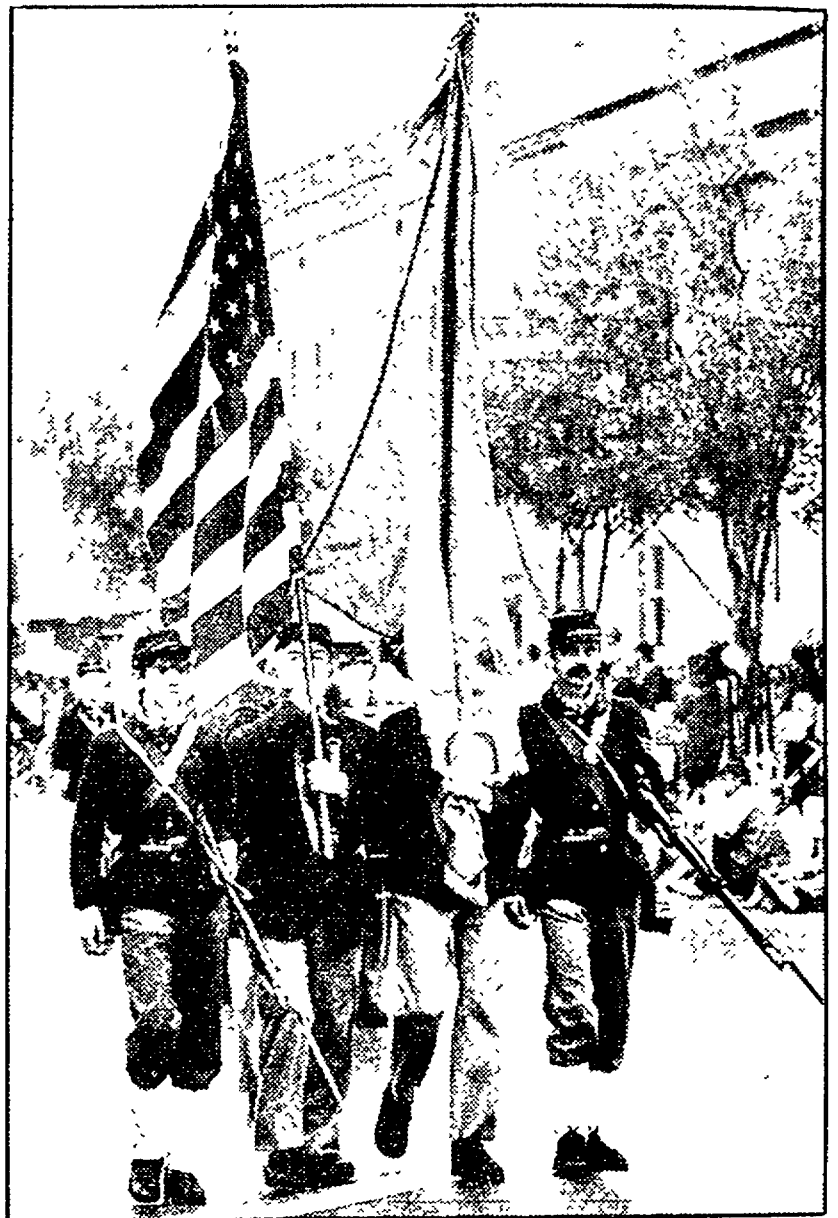
From the sound system and the floats to the barricades and the cleanup, there is more to the parade than meets the eye.

very involved procedure and requires a lot of cooperation.

"Public Safety is responsible for street closures, providing alternate routes, appointing personnel to assist inquiring parade patrons with directions, and medical assistance for anyone associated with or watching the parade," said Goss. "On really hot parade days public safety sets up a water spray that people can walk under to cool off.

"One of the best aspects of working with Farmington/Farmington Hills is the sense of community that exists. About 44-50 department members are required to make parade day run smoothly. Since we only have 22 full-time staff members, it is necessary for us to call on the Farmington volunteer reserve and the Farmington Hills auxiliary to assist us.

"These people are trained in both police department and fire department procedures and volunteer their time to help us when asked. Members of these volunteer organizations range from plumbers to lawyers to aspiring po-

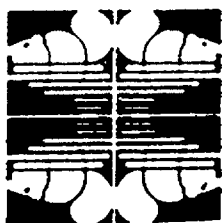

Craft shows draw crowds

More than 80 artists and crafters will congregate in downtown Farmington July 14-17 to exhibit what is expected to be some of the most interesting and diverse quality items offered during the annual Founders Festival.

The annual festival arts and crafts display, which is at Grand River and Farmington roads, is recognized as one of the finer shows among artists, drawing talent from all over the United States. Represented will be all kinds of pieces, from jewelry, stained glass, ceramics, spice wreaths, tapestries and quilts to pottery, porcelain dolls, blown glass and hand-crafted copper-top cupolas.

According to Jody Soronen, executive director of the Farmington/Farmington Hills Chamber of Commerce, to assure that the products offered are of top quality and variety, all prospective crafters must submit an entry application describing their art form as well as photographs of their work.

A jury comprised of festival organizers knowledgeable about crafts and art fairs picks just some of the crafters to participate.

"This year we had an incredible response," said Soronen. "There were many talented art-

ists we had to put on a waiting list — unfortunately we can't go over our allowed capacity."

Returning to the festival are Herm and Kathy Golnik, former Michigan residents, who will display their miniature sculptures of people and animals made from dough.

According to Herm Golnik, their craft began as a hobby of making Christmas tree ornaments. "People would visit us for the holidays and say, 'You should display those in craft fairs' — so at some point we decided to take their advice."

And for the last 17 years it's one of the activities the Golnik's enjoy: attending 20-30 art fairs each year.

The Golnik's sculpture recipe is fairly simple, though is a product of many years of refining color and durability. Each figure is made from dough and food coloring, while facial features are painted on and the final product is covered with a coat of polyurethane.

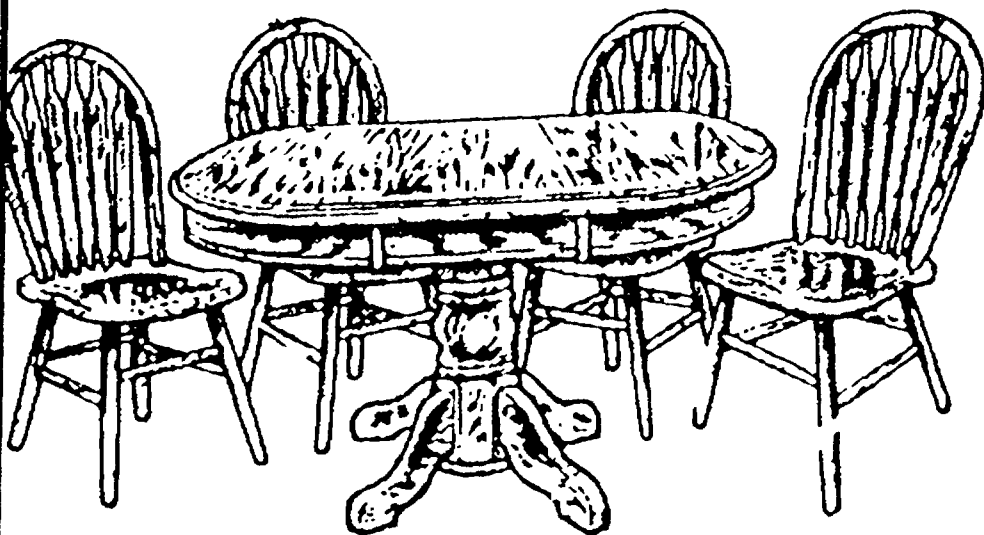
The sculptures, which range from people and characters such as Winnie the Pooh, Garfield and Barney to frogs and cows, are priced

Entertainment in the works

If you like to laugh and love entertainment, you'll want to be present for this year's Showmobile Entertainment during the annual Founders Festival.

According to Eric Johnston, entertainment chairman, this year's entertainment will be some of the most exciting ever. Along with a variety of local entertainers, Johnston has arranged for four dynamic acts to get the crowd roaring, namely: Dwight David Carroll, folk

singer; Paul Locrichio, professional comedian; Mark St. John, magician; and Alexander Zonjic, popular jazz flutist.

As Johnston reviews this year's entertainment lineup, he recalls his first year of organizing acts for the festival.

"The first year we had no budget and the showmobile concept (an elevated stage on

from \$3-\$7 each.

Other visiting artists include Rob Kitchens, Jeff Nelson and Mike Lancey of Ossining, New York. Their art is marquetry — an old craft characteristic of Louis XVI and Dutch furniture.

The artisans create pictures that are formed by the insertion of different pieces and types of wood veneer into a hard wood.

"We begin with a drawing," explained Lancey. "Once the drawing is complete, we divide it into different pieces of wood. It's a tedious process to choose the most ideal wood for each

photo. For one picture, we can use as few as eight or as many as 25 different kinds of wood, and one picture can have up to 200 of pieces of wood in it."

On display at the festival will be pictures, mirrors and clocks. According to Lancey, their designs tend to favor outdoor wildlife and nautical scenes. Prices range from \$30 to \$800.

Arts and crafts will also be displayed at the Masonic Temple, Grand River and Farmington Road, and Warren's Corner, 23285 Farmington Road, during the festival.

wheels) was a wash, though we stuck with it," he said.

"The next year, we had a small budget to work with and were able to bring in some acts that were truly excellent and things seemed to catch on. Since then, demand has allowed us to expand and bring in a number of quality, professional acts."

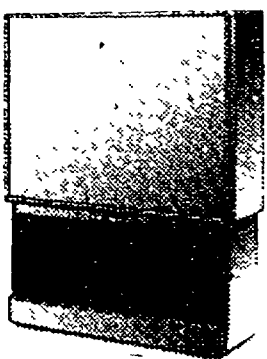
He has also entertained cruise line audiences and participated in the European U.S.O. tour. Spectators can laugh along with this act Thursday at 8 p.m.

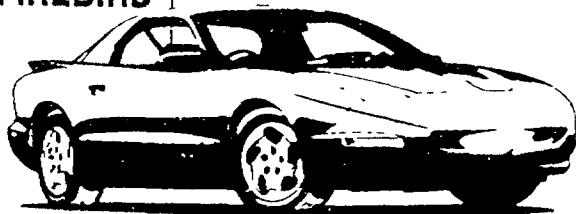
