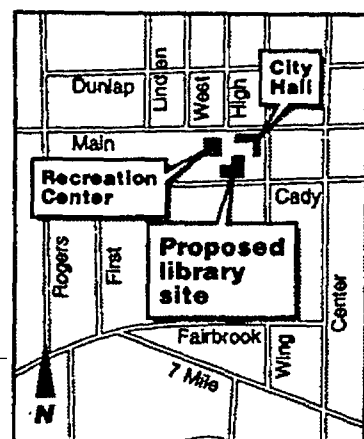

Board identifies potential district library site

Proposed District Library Site

In looking for sites for a new library facility, the Northville District Library Board stumbled across a 17-year-old set of architectural renderings.

Those faded renderings, for a two-story freestanding library facility behind city hall, have become the latest blueprint for the potential future of Northville's library services.

A district library board subcommittee that has been considering potential sites since March reviewed the renderings Friday and agreed to present the proposal to the full board at its Aug. 10 meeting. The proposal calls for a 25,000-square-foot structure on West Cady straddling the hill between city hall and the Northville Recreation Center.

Because part of the facility would

sit on land owned by Northville Public Schools, the school system's permission would be needed before the project could proceed.

School officials had agreed to deed land to the community for the library in 1976, provided that Northville School District residents in Salem and Lyon townships could use the facility.

The board also has not decided whether to seek millage for a new library, or only seek enough millage to operate a district library out of the existing facility at city hall until a new site can be purchased.

A district library serves more than one community and has its own direct, dedicated voter-approved millage. State law allows a district library board to seek between 1-2 mills for operating expenses and, if necessary, site acquisition and

construction.

Northville's board, formed earlier this year, has until May 1, 1994, to obtain voter approval of a dedicated millage between 1-2 mills for acquisition and/or operation of a district library.

The board plans to submit a millage request to the electorate sometime after Dec. 1.

Subcommittee members noted Friday that the Cady site would be located near downtown Northville among other municipal and community centers, on publicly-owned land next to a park. Potential drawbacks include parking conflicts with the recreation department and the added cost of security and staff for a two-story building.

"The positives certainly outweigh the negatives, but our primary concern is parking," said Subcommittee

Chair Wendy Gutowski.

School Supt. Dr. Leonard Rezmierski said the proposal looked good at first glance. "It looks complementary to the area," he said. "Whether or not it's practical, that remains to be discussed."

Rezmierski added that the schools would hope to be more involved in a new district library. "Obviously, if we're going to support the concept, the schools should be part of that concept," he said. That involvement could include shared technology and joint catalogues.

The Cady site is the latest of several under consideration by the board. It was near the top of a list of potential sites in 1988 until it was eclipsed by the Haller Library proposal.

"We have studied this in detail,

through many committees, and this is the spot we'd really like to recommend," said Board member John Buckland, who also sat on the 1988 Library Site Committee that identified the Ford plant and Cady site as their top two choices.

The Ford Valve Plant was dropped as a potential library site earlier this year after public criticism of the site at a Friends of Northville Library meeting in March, and after board members raised concerns about the plant's condition and potential contamination.

Other potential sites including the Open Door Christian Church and the First Baptist Church at Wing and Randolph were crossed off the list because the existing buildings would likely have to be torn down to create a suitable library.

Arson destroys Highland structure; Reward is offered for information

Northville Township police are looking for the arsonists who set fire to a storage shed adjacent to the Highland Lakes clubhouse just before dawn Friday morning.

The blaze engulfed the shed and destroyed its contents before firefighters arrived at the scene at 4:40 a.m. Township and state fire investigators have determined the blaze was intentionally set, but they don't have any suspects in the case yet.

There were no injuries.

The State Arson Control division is offering a \$5,000 reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of anyone connected with the early morning blaze.

Highland Lakes Property Manager Ray Thompson watched fire crews sift through the pile of charred rubble Friday morning after the blaze was extinguished.

"There's about \$40,000 worth of damage," he said eyeballing the rubble. "And we lost about \$16,000 worth of equipment."

Thompson said he believes young people are to blame for the incident because of recent problems property managers have had with teen loitering and drinking in the Northville subdivision.

The manager said the wooden storage shed used to be a gazebo before it was converted to a storage shed and steel doors were installed on the front of it. At the scene state investigators found evidence to indicate vandals had broken into the shed before ignited it.

Thompson said when he first arrived at the scene, he thought two security mopeds had been stolen from the shed. Investigators failed to find any evidence of the mopeds in the charred remains, but later did recover both motorbikes in the lake behind the shed.

Vandals also untied five boats from the dock behind the shed, shattered a security light across the neighborhood lake and removed a 200-pound manhole cover before they fled the scene.

Thompson said he found an empty bottle of whiskey near the scene when he arrived that morning.

The property manager believes Friday morning's incident was in retaliation for the manage-

Township man will stand trial for sex offenses

A Northville Township man was arrested July 19 and charged with one count of second degree criminal sexual conduct.

Jack Allen waived his right to a preliminary exam on Thursday, July 29, before 35th District Court Judge John E. MacDonald. He was bound over to Wayne County Circuit Court where he will be arraigned on Aug. 12.

The 35-year-old Stoneleigh resident was arrested after a juvenile relative of his told a counselor from protective services he made her touch his genitals on three separate occasions. The three incidents allegedly took place in Allen's Northville home when no one else was there.

The girl told the counselor Allen threatened to confine her to a time-out chair if she told anyone.

According to the township's police report, Allen denied the charges and told a department detective the three incidents were all accidental encounters. The man refused to give police a written statement at the time of his arrest and wanted to consult an attorney before agreeing to take a polygraph test.

In Michigan, second degree criminal sexual conduct is punishable by up to 15 years imprisonment.

In light of the criminal charges, Northville Township Police and Charles Kellett, a Wayne County prosecutor, asked the court to prohibit contact between the man and the child. MacDonald denied the request and granted Allen permission to visit the girl as long as a therapist or psychiatrist was present at the time.

Allen declined comment on the charges after the court proceeding. He was released on a personal bond.

State police are slow providing documents

After a six-week delay, the Michigan State Police have complied with requests by this newspaper to supply police reports for publication. The requests were made under the state's Freedom of Information Act.

In a letter dated July 27, the Michigan State Police agreed to supply 88 police reports, some dating back to June 18, at a cost of \$201. The letter had been sent by Rosemarie Pfifer, director of the State Police Central Records Division in Lansing, and was signed by Sgt. Malcolm Hall, the department's Freedom of Information coordinator.

Police reports are viewed by reporters from this paper on a regular basis at local police stations. All local police agencies cooperate fully, and the results appear in each edition

under the "Police News" heading on Page 4-A. The Northville post of the Michigan State Police has been the lone exception.

Northville Record Managing Editor Michael Malott expressed his dissatisfaction at the response of the State Police, pointing out that the documents, some requested six weeks ago, were not made available in a timely fashion.

He added that the paper's FOI requests made it clear that reporters only want to view the documents, not obtain copies. He said the actions appear to violate Michigan's FOI Act.

"Simply put, we expect the state police to follow the law," said Malott. "As a state agency responsible for enforcing the law, it is all the more important that it abides by the laws that apply to it. The state police cannot

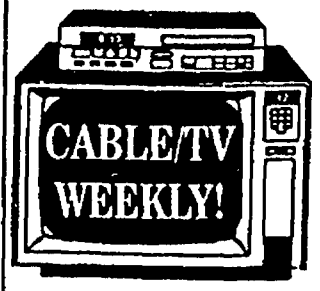

Rezmierski given high marks on evaluation

There are more important things in life other than money.

That's Supt. Leonard Rezmierski's philosophy behind accepting a wage freeze for the second year in a row.

Northville Board of Education members gave the superintendent a high rating on his evaluation, even better than last year's; however, they decided to freeze his pay and grant him only a one-year extension to his contract. Budget concerns were reasons behind the move.

"Putting all things into place, I talked about (the wage freeze) with my family," Rezmierski said. "I don't want to be under-compensated and I don't want my family to be hurt, but I don't think that's the case."

"It's just a reflection of the times and circumstances our district is in. I'm just happy that I have a job in a

district I'm appreciative about."

Rezmierski said he felt very good about his evaluation, which took four hours to conduct. The process was open to the public at Rezmierski's request.

The superintendent received a perfect rating by all board members in section one of the evaluation regarding his performance as chief executive of the board.

"Adherence to and knowledge of the board's written and updated policies is excellent," Trustee Patricia Custer wrote on her evaluation form.

Secretary Glenna Davis said she was happy that there were never any surprises.

"Meetings are scheduled when appropriate and phone calls used when necessary," she wrote.

In the second portion of his evaluation, board members graded Rezmierski on district performance. The highest rating for each category

is a five. The categories, rating and board member comments are as follows:

● Improvement of Instructional Program, 4.8.

"Major improvements in the curriculum and instructional areas have been made," wrote trustee Jay Dunkerley. "These include the whole language program and the high school math program."

Custer, who gave Rezmierski a 4 rating, wrote she would like to have more follow-up on new programs.

"I know how the language arts is supposed to look and when teachers are in-service," she wrote. "I would like more information as to how the program will be evaluated, how it fits into students' days and which students will benefit first."

erley, 5; Davis, 5; Jean Hansen, 5; Robert McMahon, 5; Carol Rahimi, 5.

● Student Safety, Health and Well Being, 4.8.

Once again, Custer was the only board member to grade below a 5 rating in this area. Custer said she would have liked for transportation safety issues to be further addressed and believes more assertiveness should be used during crisis issues such as the intruder at the elementary and the latchkey aide accused of criminal sexual misconduct.

"Parents want the superintendent to know how he's going to solve or prevent this problem, not how well procedures were followed," Custer wrote.

Other board members credited the superintendent with the formation of

the district crisis team and building security plans.

● Facility Management and Planning, 4.4.

Most of the criticism Rezmierski received in this category had to do with the school boundary issue.

"The process used to determine changes in the elementary school boundaries should be looked at to learn how not to do it," wrote McMahon, president of the board.

● Management and Organization of the District, 4.1.

"... The superintendent needs to provide more lead time for board members to discuss and make deci-

sions," wrote board treasurer Brown.

"In spite of reductions in staff and external pressures, we have had a successful year," Hansen wrote.

● Financial Responsibility. Rezmierski received a perfect 5 rating in this area.

"The budget was managed to within 0.1 percent which is phenomenal," Brown wrote.

● Community Relations, 4.4.

Board members lauded Rezmierski's visibility in the community, but suggested he have more contact with non-school related groups. Some also suggested he provide the newspaper with a guest column.

● Networking with County/State/National Organizations. Once again, Rezmierski received a perfect rating for his involvement in district issues and membership in such organizations such as the Michigan Out of Formula Districts Association and several superintendent groups.

The last portion of the evaluation dealt with strategic planning. A perfect score was handed down on Rezmierski's handling of the revised strategic plan.

Rezmierski said he felt the board was very objective in its evaluation of him. He has already begun work on implementing new ideas to correct some of the areas he scored below the perfect 5 rating.

He plans on meeting with experts in public relations to streamline communications with the community. But, probably the most important

change Rezmierski is looking for is in cost-saving measures.

One idea he has involves giving funds to building administrators to run their programs. Of any money left over at the end of the year, the administrator receives half while the other half is returned to the district's general fund. That money could be saved or be used the following year for an appropriate school activity.

"That doesn't mean they get a jaccuzzi in the school's teacher lounge," Rezmierski said. "But maybe there's a video series they want to buy for the kids or a speaker they want to come in and talk to the kids."

Of course, the district would have to pick a building and pilot the program in, Rezmierski said.

"I want everyone to participate in cost-savings," Rezmierski said. "I don't mean I want kids to have to look


through the trash for pencils. I just want to share the concept that there's a reason not to waste."

"We have one fault in education. We don't encourage people to save. The phenomena in education is spend it or lose it."

Another idea for a pilot program Rezmierski has is having the teachers meet with their students before a school year begins. The staff would come in two weeks before classes and schedule a one-hour interview with each of his or her new students and parents.

Of course, that program would have to be phased in, possibly grade by grade, or by building. In addition, the extra work would have to be addressed in the teacher's contract, Rezmierski said.

School officials move to preempt gang problem

Northville school Supt. Leonard Rezmierski admits he may be putting the cart before the horse by addressing gangs in the district's student code of conduct.

In this case, though, he hopes the horse, or the gangs, never arrive.

The superintendent maintains there is no gang problem in the Northville school district, but is suggesting the policy sub-committee review a new clause dealing with gang activity in the code of conduct at its meeting Tuesday night.

The proposed clause, titled "Gang Insignia," reads as follows:

"A student shall not wear or possess any clothing, jewelry, symbol or other thing that may reasonably be perceived by any student, teacher or administrator as evidence of membership in or affiliation with any gang:

"A student shall not commit any act, verbal or non-verbal, in furtherance of the interests of any gang or gang activity, including, but not limited to, (a) soliciting others for mem-

bership in any gang or gang related activity, (b) requesting any person to pay protection or otherwise intimidating or threatening any person, (c) committing any other illegal act or violation of school district rules or policies, or (d) inciting other students to act with physical violence on any person."

The clause defines a gang as a "group of two or more persons whose purposes or activities include the commission of illegal acts or violations of school district rules or policies."

Rezmierski said he recommended the board consider the clause after hearing a police speaker report on gang activity in Michigan.

"Police advised us to be aware of the movement," he said. "Suburbs are vulnerable. I don't want to dramatize this if (gangs) aren't so by making it so, but by having this policy we're giving the message that we care enough about our students not to tolerate this . . . I don't want to naively say if we don't do anything about it, it won't happen."

City police have seen little evidence of gang activity in Northville,

though as Chief Rod Cannon said, "We certainly can't say that we are immune." Cannon noted that there have been isolated incidents of "skin heads" and white supremacists operating in the area, though few of the people involved in those incidents were local.

Det./Sgt. David Fendelet heard firsthand accounts of gang activity from a Detroit gangster, during a March 17 seminar on the subject at the Canton Public Safety Department. The speaker told law enforcement agents that most suburban youths who adopt gang styles are not true gangsters.

"He says they're not gangs, they're a bunch of wanna-bes," Fendelet said. "They're just picking up the symbols that they see when they go down to Detroit or copying what they see on TV."

Fendelet added that inner city gangs have little interest in moving their own activities to the suburbs, according to the speaker.

"Gangs do not want to come out to the suburbs other than to visit girls," he said. "They know that the cops out here will mess with them. Downtown, they have their own turf and the cops

don't have time to deal with them."

Rezmierski has been on the school board policy sub-committee for almost 10 years. From past experience, he said issues such as this one have to be addressed if not to eliminate a potential problem, to at least have a policy to deal with it.

"There are things in the student code of conduct that talk about designer drugs," he said. "We talk about guns. We don't have those problems, but we don't want to write in a policy after (the fact) if something does happen."

"That way we're not left vulnerable. This is the same thing. I'm not saying we have gangs."

Rezmierski said he recognizes "kids will be kids" and if a group of kids decide to wear their jeans rolled up, chances are it won't be considered a gang. However, if administrators feel students are demonstrating inappropriate behavior, they will talk to the students about it.

The superintendent used the high school group of students who referred to themselves as Skinheads Against Racial Prejudice (SHARP) as an example. Members of the group had shaved heads.

"I met some of them at football games," Rezmierski said. "They really were acting appropriately. They expressed themselves in the way they needed to, in a way I wouldn't necessarily have chosen to, (but) without violating any rules. Just because you

look different doesn't mean you're bad."

The policy sub-committee will meet at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday in the board conference room, third floor of the central office building, 501 W. Main St.

Lincoln catches fire in parking lot of restaurant

A 1982 Lincoln caught fire in the parking lot at Rocky's of Northville Restaurant on Tuesday, July 27. The car was completely destroyed by fire and smoke. When officers arrived the entire front end was on fire. The officer's report indicates that the hood was badly burned, the engine compartment was melting and the front tires had already melted. Total damage was about \$10,000.

HUBCAP THEFT: A Westland woman said the hubcaps were stolen from her 1992 Chevrolet Lumina while she was shopping at the A & P grocery store on Seven Mile on Wednesday, July 28.

TRAFFIC ACCIDENT: A Northville Township woman and man were treated for minor injuries last Wednesday after the man's car collided with the woman's on Sheldon Road

near Seven Mile. She was taken to St. Mary's and he was transported to Providence Medical Center in Novi. The woman stopped near the intersection when she saw an animal in the road but the man failed to stop in time before rear ending the woman. The man was not ticketed in the incident.

EIGHT MILE PILE UP: Construction crews weren't the only ones holding up traffic Thursday morning at Eight Mile near Meadowbrook. A west bound Eight Mile Road driver pulled into the center lane to avoid hitting a car in front of him when he collided with a driver heading east on Eight Mile.

There were no injuries in the case, but traffic was backed up because of the heavy construction. The west bound driver was ticketed for the incident.

MORE MUSTANG THEFT: Township police had their fourth encounter involving Ford Mustangs on Wednesday, July 28. This time thieves caused about \$400 in damage after they stole the tail lights and the outer casting for the brake system and tail lights system from a 1991 Ford Mustang parked on James-town. Police believe the incident is related to several other cases involving Ford Mustangs.

CARS VANDALIZED: A car parked outside two downtown businesses was scratched sometime between 11 a.m. and midnight July 25. The car was parked outside Papa Romano's, 117 E. Dunlap, until the owner drove it to the Starting Gate Saloon at 135 N. Center about 10:30 p.m. The next morning, she noticed that an obscene word and other marks had been scratched into the side, causing about \$200 in

damages.

A car parked in a Holmbury driveway had to be totally repainted after vandals broke eggs on the roof, poured an unknown liquid all over the car and scratched the paint sometime between 11 p.m. July 27 and 7:30 a.m. July 28. The car's rear hatch was also jammed shut. It and a nearby light pole and trees were wrapped with paper towels and masking tape.

Damage was estimated at \$1,840.

HARASSING PHONE CALLS: A Northville woman has filed a complaint with city police over a string of harassing phone calls she has received in the past two months. The woman said she has received 25-30 calls from a man who tells her he wants to have sex with her. His voice sounds like that of a white male in his early 20s. The man told the woman he saw her at Meijer and knows

where she lives.

TRESPASSERS BUSTED AT SWIM CLUB: City police found five youths trespassing at the Northville Swim Club, 646 Baseline Road, just before midnight July 28. Police had investigated a report of a large crowd socializing behind Northville High School and found no one there when they decided to check out the swim club. They found four of the subjects swimming and diving in the pool and a fifth sitting by the side.

The subjects—a Farmington Hills girl, 17; a Farmington Hills boy, 17; a Northville male, 17; a Northville male, 18 and a Farmington Hills male, 18—all were cited for trespassing.

LOITERING AT MILL RACE: Four out-of-town people in their 20s were cited for loitering July 27 after police found them at Mill Race Historical

Village on Griswold. The four, a Plymouth man, a Canton man and a Westland man, all 22, were with a 20-year-old Canton woman when police found them by the waterfall on Mill Race property at 3:10 a.m. They told police they were "hanging out."

PROWLING CHARGE: Two Northville boys walking home along a wooded path were charged with prowling July 28. They were 14 and 16, were heading west toward Griswold along the edge of fenced-in Ford property north of Main about 2:45 a.m. when they were spotted by city police. Police issued them prowling violations and cited the 14-year-old for violating the city's curfew ordinance, and turned them over to their relatives.

State police delay before releasing reports to paper

pick and choose which laws they will follow, nor should they take the FOI Act lightly.

"Still, they do not appear to be in compliance. They are extremely late in responding. Up to this point, there had been no response at all. And now they want to charge us \$201 to read these reports. We've made it very clear we don't want copies; we only want to read the reports, just as we read reports from every other police agency. To charge us any amount to look at those reports is ludicrous and I don't see any provision in the FOI Act that allows for it."

"Clearly, the state police are trying to do everything they can to keep this newspaper from reporting about their activities. I haven't the slightest idea why. But they need to remember they are the police agency for the State of Michigan, not some South American banana republic."

Dawn Phillips, an attorney for the Michigan Press Association, agreed that the State Police appeared to be in violation of the FOI Act.

"They have a duty to respond," Phillips said. "It's unfortunate that a public body as important to the citizenry as the State Police is unresponsive. The data they control are important to the citizenry: the locations of crimes, the modus operandi

of crimes... To be unresponsive is a disservice to the citizens."

"It's unfortunate that they think they cannot follow the law."

Beginning in early June, this paper asked to view police reports at Post 21.

Lt. David Werner, commanding officer at the Northville post, stated on June 8 that no reports other than traffic accidents would be released without an FOI request. He then added that fatal traffic accidents would require an FOI request as well.

Werner declared that all FOI requests by this paper would be forwarded to the Michigan State Police Central Records Division in Lansing. There the request would be processed, the documents copied, and the newspaper billed for the state's cost of compliance.

This paper filed FOI requests at the Northville Post on June 15, June 22, July 2, July 9, July 16 and July 25. In all, 102 reports were requested, using case numbers taken from the post's complaint book.

No response was received until the Pifer/Hall letter of July 27.

In that letter the State Police agreed to provide the requested reports, but claimed exemption on 14 of them. Exemption was claimed on 12 cases because reports had not yet been filed. Exemption was also

claimed for two others "based upon an open investigation."

Michigan's FOI Act requires all public bodies, such as the State Police, to release all public documents on request. The Act identifies police reports as public documents.

Some exemptions from release are allowed. The exemptions are quite limited, however, and in all cases the document must still be released, albeit with the exempt sections edited, deleted or blacked out.

The FOI Act allows no exemption for "open investigation" unless such release would interfere with law enforcement procedures, disclose techniques, or disclose the identity of confidential sources.

Both of the cases withheld for reasons of "open investigation" were identified in the complaint book as criminal sexual conduct cases.

The act also requires a public body, when in receipt of an FOI request, to respond within five business days, either by providing the requested documents, or a written explanation as to which exemptions the agency would claim for non-release.

That the State Police did not respond to the FOI requests of June 15, June 25, July 2, July 9 and July 16 within the prescribed time appears to be a violation of the FOI Act.

ment's move to tighten security and discourage teens from loitering in the neighborhood.

"We've had to tighten up security here in the last three weeks because of problems we've been having with loitering and drinking," he said. "So we've started asking folks to move on and began enforcing our private

property rules."

Thompson said management was forced to beef up security after receiving several reports of outsiders pool jumping after hours. Security guards were not on duty when vandals stuck last Friday, Thompson said.

"Our security was not on at 4 a.m. but I think they (the vandals) just drove in and started drinking whiskey."

Township police and fire investigators stayed at the scene Friday to pick through the rubble looking for clues to determine how the fire was started. At press time Friday, neither knew how the blaze had been ignited.

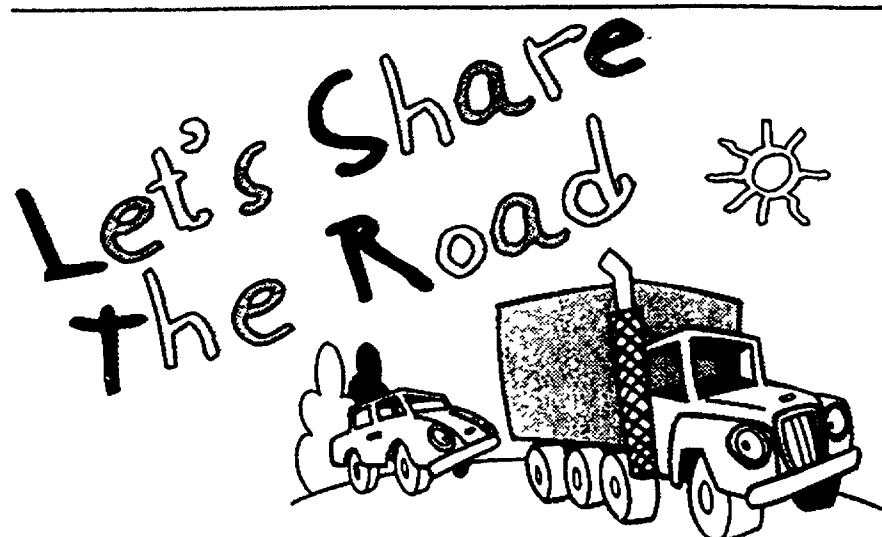

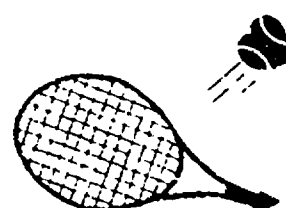


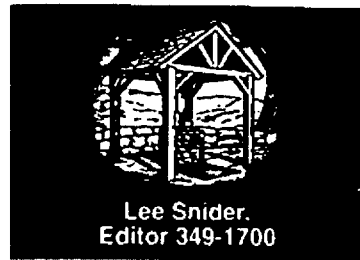

Our Opinion

Gang prohibition is premature reaction

There is a fine-line difference between acting to prevent a potential problem and overreacting to an imagined threat.

It appears, despite good intentions, that the Northville Board of Education's policy sub-committee is poised to do the latter.

The sub-committee will meet tomorrow night and consider adding to the student code of conduct a provision to ban all clothing and accessories that could suggest affiliation with gangs.

The clause wisely prohibits gang activity — including membership recruitment, intimidation and violence — but clearly goes too far in attempting to prohibit all manner of dress that could be even remotely suggestive of "gang" involvement.

The suspect portion of the proposed clause, titled "Gang Insignia," reads:

"A student shall not wear or possess any clothing, jewelry, symbol or other thing that may reasonably be perceived by any student, teacher or administrator as evidence of membership in or affiliation with any gang."

The trouble with this provision is its vagueness. What is meant by "reasonably perceived?" According to definitions in the code, any two persons dressing or styling their hair alike could come under suspicion for being gang members.

The code goes on to define a gang as any group that commits or intends to commit illegal acts or violations of school district rules. But, one has to ask, is it not patently unfair to presume ill-intent based on mode of dress?

A group of students can share a common identity through their appearance and still be well meaning. Consider the group Skinheads Against Racial Prejudice (SHARP), for instance. They wear their hair and their clothing in a fashion that is similar to that of white supremacists who openly foster bigotry and racial hatred. That, however, is where the similarity ends; SHARP members, as the name indicates, oppose racial and ethnic discrimination.

School officials might argue that

members of SHARP would not be subject to disciplinary action under the code, but what about new groups whose reputations are not yet established? Could they expect to be closely watched until they proved themselves to the satisfaction of school officials? Would students be used as informants to provide inside information about the likely intentions of potential gang members?

Obviously, school officials are reacting to recent reports of gang activity spreading from the inner city to the suburbs. Public safety officials are warning of a disturbing trend whereby gangs are moving into the outlying areas to recruit new members. Gang activity is on the rise downriver, and there are reports of gang members hanging out at shopping centers in Livonia and Novi, including Twelve Oaks Mall.

But, while school officials are justified in keeping an eye on gang movement, care should be taken not to overreact. Fortunately, the Northville community is not the kind of place where full-scale gang activity is ever likely to take place. As one city police official was told, suburban youths tend to adopt the outward trappings of gangs without exhibiting the characteristic aggressive behaviors.

We believe the portion of the new provision dealing with gang activity is appropriate and deals with a problem that could be demonstrated to exist. It should be written into the student code of conduct.

But the section banning whatever teachers or students perceive to be gang insignia is subjective and broad, and seems bound to lead to arbitrary and unfair application.

State Police should abide by the FOI law

At this paper, we've enjoyed cooperative relationships with the police agencies we cover. All of the local police departments allow us to view reports as part of standard operating procedure.

So when the Michigan State Police sent us a bill for \$201 to view 88 complaint reports from the Northville post — on topics ranging from burglary to rape — it came as quite a shock to us. That it took them nearly six weeks to respond to the initial request to view the reports left us downright incensed.

Michigan's Freedom of Information Act was created with the idea that members of the public should have access to the reports of the agencies that their tax dollars fund. We consider it a serious disservice to the community that the Michigan State Police does not feel it has to answer to the public it serves in a timely fashion, and charges an exorbitant amount for the privilege of viewing records it is required to produce.

Further, the law requires that all requests be answered in writing within

five days of receipt. That the State Police took as much as six weeks to respond to our requests would appear to be a direct violation of the law.

By forcing this paper to file Freedom of Information requests, and forwarding them to its Central Records Division, the Northville Post of the Michigan State Police is not only betraying the public trust; it's not even adhering to department policy. State Police Official Order No. 33 of 1989 says "Departmental members are encouraged to aggressively offer information to the news media rather than waiting for inquiries from the media."

There's one more excellent reason why the police ought to provide a method by which reports can be viewed. *It's the law.* It sets a bad precedent — not to mention that it's lousy P.R. — for a law enforcement agency to appear to act above the law.

We insist that the Northville post abide by the law and adhere to Michigan State Police policy.

The good ole days at school?

John McGuire, patriarch of the McGuire clan that owns and operates Guernsey Farms (the ice cream capitol of Southeast Michigan if you ask me), paid us a visit last week.

What he brought with him wasn't butter pecan, though (darn!). It was more like food for thought. His three little tidbits consisted of four photocopied pages. One was a pamphlet on home schooling, and another was a magazine article on motivating employees.

But the pick of the litter was a letter-to-the-editor from a Tucson, Ariz., newspaper, dated March 21, 1983. The writer, Sylvia Ford, was 90 years old, and while going through some old keepsakes she came across something of interest.

It was a teaching contract from the Tucson Public Schools, 1923, which the writer said she acquired when she was looking for a teaching job during that time.

Looking over the single sheet of paper, it's easy to see where the stereotype of the old school marm came from. That's the only kind of person that could fit the stipulations of the contract.

The contract specified that it was an agreement "between Miss (Blank) and the Board of Education" (italics mine). Further, Miss (Blank) was to be paid the princely sum of \$75 per month. I also gathered from the wording that all teachers were paid that amount regardless of school, grade level, education or seniority.

A Tucson teacher just 70 years ago was contractually obligated not to smoke cigarettes. Makes you wonder what

went on in Tucson's teacher lounges. It certainly wasn't drinking, since teachers were also forbidden to drink beer, wine or whiskey. The contract would become null and void if the teacher was found smoking or drinking.

It gets better. The teacher also agreed not to get married, keep company with men, leave town "without permission from the Chairman of the Board of Trustees," or "ride in a carriage or automobile with any man except her brother or father." This definitely wasn't a career for young, single women.

Let's not forget the dress code. Teachers were not to "dress in bright colors," use face powder, mascara or paint the lips, or wear dresses less than two inches above the ankles. They were to wear "at least two petticoats" in a desert town where 100-degree days are common.

But perhaps the most inexplicable restriction — though it explains why it caught John McGuire's attention — was that the teacher was forbidden to "loiter in downtown ice cream stores." I can't say I've ever been to an ice cream store in downtown Tucson, but having read this contract, my curiosity is piqued.

Working conditions stipulated in the contract would have made today's teachers whither. They were to sweep the classroom floor at least once daily; scrub it at least once weekly; clean the blackboard once daily; and "start the fire at 7 a.m. so the room will be warm when the children arrive."

That, by the way, was the entire contract. There was no legalese, no liability clauses. The document's sexism is reactionary, but you have to admire its simplicity.

Personally, I'd love it if one of the local school districts in upcoming negotiations plunked this document down on the bargaining table as a joke.

Schoolcraft to break ground on new \$7.9 million building

It's been 23 years since Schoolcraft College has added a new building to its campus.

But once the college completes construction of its proposed college services building, "optimistically" by January 1995, it will have been worth the wait, according to Sam Florek, director of institutional finance at Schoolcraft.

Groundbreaking ceremonies for the \$7.9 million project will take place at 4:30 p.m. Wednesday at the southwest corner of the campus.

The three-story building was designed by architect Louis G. Redstone Associates, Inc. Florek said the building will appear to have two stories facing Haggerty Road as the structure will be nestled into a hillside. The third story will be visible from the east side facing the college's liberal arts building.

The college services building will house the counseling, testing, registration, women's resource center and career and planning placement

services on the second floor, while providing space for eight classrooms and four computer classrooms on the bottom floor.

The third floor will be the new home for the business development center and the accounting and purchasing departments.

"What we really wanted to do was consolidate services," Florek said.

She added that people often feel intimidated when coming to a college for the first time, especially if they have to run from building to building to conduct their business.

"We wanted to make it very convenient for any new person coming to college," she said.

The new center will also be located next to a parking lot so potential students won't have to walk all over campus to get to the building they need.

Financing for the project will come from a combination of monies from the college's land development authority and a matching grant from the state. Schoolcraft receives money for the lease of land by the Duke development at Seven Mile and Haggerty roads.

"It's hard to find dollars in today's economy," Florek said. "We feel this is a very creative way to come up with (funds). We're very fortunate that the people who planned the college in the early days had bought all the land with it."

Almost 27,000 students attended Schoolcraft last year, including traditional and continuing education students at both the Livonia and Garden City campuses. In Garden City, the college operates the Radcliff Center in a former junior high school rented from Garden City schools.

Schoolcraft began offering classes in 1964.

Florek said the people happiest with the campus's newest addition are probably the counselors. In 1967 they were moved to a temporary building to make room for other programs, but other needs came up and the counseling department has stayed in the same building. Now, they will have offices in the new building.

The last building to be constructed at Schoolcraft was the physical education center. It was built in 1970.

Novi police vehicle is damaged

Vinegars gain favor infused with flavor

Flavored vinegars seem to be gaining in popularity as we seek ways to add zest to meals but keep fats and calories low.

The good news is that flavored vinegars are easy to make, cost a fraction of those found in specialty stores, and make unique gifts. You will need to begin the process well in advance of gift-giving time because the vinegar will take several weeks to mellow and absorb the flavor of the herbs and spices.

To prepare flavored vinegars, pour good quality commercial wine, cider or white distilled vinegar into sterilized decorative jars or bottles, each containing a generous handful of herb leaves or a long sprig of leaves. Be sure to wash the herbs before using and remove any frayed or dried leaves.

You can also substitute a few teaspoons of spices instead of herbs. Let the mixture steep for three to four weeks in a cool, dark place. Strain the mixture after steeping, if desired.

To speed up the mellowing process, you can heat the vinegar to near boiling and pour it hot into sterilized jars over crushed herbs and seeds. Let the mixture steep for one week, then strain through muslin or filter paper and return the vinegar to a sterilized bottle. Add a fresh herb sprig to the flavored vinegar.

Herbs and spices that flavor vinegar include peppercorns, tarragon, garlic, dill, rosemary, basil, orange-mint, celery seed, tumeric, mustard seed and parsley. Use these flavorings singly or combine them. With a fancy vinegar, vinegar and oil salad dressings need not be dull.

If you do not want to make your own vinegar, there is a wide variety available. The most common is apple cider vinegar, used in pickles, and dressings for vegetables and fruits. Since it is made from apple juice it has an aroma and flavor of fruit.

Distilled white vinegar is also used in pickling and for some dressings or marinades. It has a very sharp distinct flavor, however, so use it in small amounts.

Balsamic vinegar is made from white grapes but is aged for several years so it ends up to be a dark brown color. The mellow sweet-sour flavor is very popular in Italian cooking of stews, salads, fruits and even ice cream. It tends to be expensive but a little goes a long way.

Raspberry vinegar is a pale raspberry color with a real fruit aroma. This vinegar is a good addition to chicken, and duck besides fruit salads.

Rice vinegar is widely used in Chinese and Japanese cooking. With its clear to pale gold color and mild-sweet flavor it is added to noodle dishes, salad dressings and dips.

Wine vinegars are either red or white with a pleasing aroma. Rule of thumb is to use the darker red wine vinegar with meats and marinades where color doesn't matter, while white wine vinegar is used when the food needs to be kept light, such as fish or potato salad.

The flavor of vinegar is essential to many dishes around the world. When cooking with vinegar, remember it is highly volatile and its flavor will diminish with heat and air. Add vinegar to a dish only after removing it from the heat to help retain its flavor. If you don't want the pungent vinegar flavor, add during the cooking and allow the vinegar to boil off slightly.

Add a teaspoon of white vinegar to any gelatin recipe. It helps keep molded salads firmer. With a little splash of vinegar, seven-minute cake frosting will stay whiter and softer, or a little white vinegar will cut the sugary sweetness of pecan or maple syrup pie.

High quality vinegar has a fruitiness and refreshing acidity that can add a nice lift to many foods. Salads benefit from a splash of vinegar, and adding a little vinegar to the water when poaching eggs keep the whites from spreading and will make the eggs more tender. Vinegar also acts as a meat tenderizer, slows

Freedom of Choice

Pasta, Southwest fare for the choosy

If you're looking for an alternative to fast food that's nutritious, flavorful, and just a little nouveau, you may want to check out the new menu concept Rich Willerer has instituted at Heavenly Bakery.

Since he's taken over his mother's bakery in the Highland Lakes Plaza on Seven Mile Road, the Schoolcraft College graduate still cranks out 150 to 200 loaves of bread a day. But he's also found success offering lunch and dinner items.

Now Willerer is taking another big step, this time offering create-your-own menus for both pasta and Southwest style dishes. The Southwest style, which combines the best elements of Mexican and native American cooking, has become something of a phenomenon in the Detroit area, with the success of restaurants like Border Cantina in Novi, or Chimayo in Pontiac.

The create-your-own Southwest menu is remarkable in its simplicity, even if the flavor and variety suggest a virtual battery of chefs in the back room.

"The Southwest menu has a lot of common denominators," Willerer said. "I need to have only 20 things prepped, and still I can do the variety. I wanted to offer choices, but I didn't want to overpower people."

A chicken burrito or taco can be topped with salsa, guacamole, sour cream, or a black bean puree that's lighter than refried beans.

"I didn't want refried beans because I didn't want to use any lard," he said. "This just uses simmered beans, braised in a little tomato product. I only need to soak the beans for about an hour."

Quesadillas, "a Mexican cheese sandwich," are made with just the slightest crispness in the soft tortilla shell, thanks to a spray of oil. Tostadas and nachos are on the menu too.

"Customers will have their choice of items," Willerer said, "but we'll try to steer them in the right direction. Sometimes they come in and say I want this and this and this, and we have to say, 'You might not like the way that tastes.'"

Many Southwest menus fall into a certain sameness, Willerer feels.

"If you do black beans, salsa and meat on everything, where's the distinction?" he asked.

One answer is his Southwest hummus. Whereas the Middle Eastern hummus is a puree of chick peas, sesame paste, garlic and lemon juice, Willerer gives it a Southwest flair by blending in roasted red pepper. He smiles big and adds, "that turns it pink."

Willerer said he thinks the pasta will be a big hit as well.

"I think pasta is going to be big," he said. "I mean really big. I see it replacing pizza. It's already happening in New York. Pasta bars are opening up. It'll be 10 years before it catches on here, though."

Willerer laments the fact that Midwesterners still have a hard time viewing food as a treat. A stint in New York as a manufacturer's representative taught him differently.

"In New York, if you want to treat yourself right, you'll go out and get yourself a nice meal," he said. "Here, it's a little different."

He added, however, that he sees no shortage of adventurous souls willing to try out something different.

"A lot of people want to come in and try something different every time they're in here," he said. "We want to do something out of the ordinary, so people will keep coming back."

The pasta menu will feature vegetable pastas, like spinach or tomato. They're homemade and fresh, unlike the dried variety you get out of a box.

"Most of the flavored pastas made with dehydrated flour lose the character of the

spinach, tomatoes or beets or whatever," he said in explaining his choice of fresh made pasta.

Sauces like alfredo and marinara will find their places on the menu. The pastas will be available in a variety of shapes — cannelloni, cappeletti, fettuccini — and some will be filled.

In all, there will be 12 different items available.

"What makes this work is that when you go to an Italian restaurant, you can't remember the name of the dish you ate," he said. "But if you can remember what was in it, you can come here, and you're golden."

To demonstrate, he tosses a little of everything into the filling for his cannelloni. Some ricotta, some roasted sweet red peppers, basil and parsley from the Willerer garden.

"It makes a big difference using fresh herbs," he says. "We use our own natural fertilizer, you know, like the fish you didn't want to eat. You just have to water them like crazy. They're weeds basically."

Chilling effect helps fish keep great flavor

Tom Colbert has been working for — no, with — the Foleys for over two decades. He can remember the plant when it was in downtown Boston. A metropolitan renovation spree dictated their move out of the city proper.

Everyone at Foleys is wonderful, Tom is exceptional. His sense of humor, interest in others' welfare, and honesty are extraordinary. Being Irish doesn't hurt either.

On several occasions I was lucky

enough to get to spend some quality conversation time with him and was thoroughly entertained. I'm sure that these good qualities are the reason Tom was assigned the next part of the seminar — the plant.

We were told to dress warm and wear sensible shoes, preferably a rubber type. I just couldn't imagine wearing boots in the middle of the summer. At the end of the two hours I wished I had. This was no ordinary plant tour. Temperatures were cold, colder and coldest.

A rule of thumb: for every day that fish is kept, allow 2 degrees above 32 or as close to it as possible. We were reminded that nothing can be done to improve the quality of the whole fish delivered. If Foley buyers don't do their job, we don't get the quality we deserve.

The whole fish first must pass the eye, smell and touch tests. Then it is transported to the plant in sterilized containers in refrigerated trucks where it is re-iced with their super cold flake ice. This is no ordinary ice. Flaking allows better "packing" ability.

The entire plant is refrigerated. The entire processing procedure is done under strict temperature regulations.

Next to temperature, bacteria counts are of utmost importance. A bacteriologist monitors bacteria counts which are well below acceptable counts elsewhere. The processing procedure begins with a chlorinated wash for the whole fish to lower bacterial count, and one spray to the finished product.

All fish are handcut by skilled workers and there are absolutely no brines or phos-

phates allowed. Fillets are then "candled" or moved via an underlighted conveyor to detect and remove any bloodstains or the occasional parasite.

Even the containers that the fillets are packed in are special. Not plastic (which is an insulator of heat and does not conduct cold), but a metal, lead-free tin.

Each layer is lined with parchment to keep the skin of one fillet from touching the flesh of another. Skin is known to have higher bacteria counts than flesh. The parchment also decreases moisture loss due to evaporation and exposure to air.

These tins are then super chilled prior to shipping to reduce their contents to an optimum temperature for shipping. Each order is then filled and packed in master cartons for the trip to the customer. All of this is accomplished in such a timely man-

ner that I receive fish that was processed only a day before.

The facility tour was informative. We viewed species whole and filleted. The ocean catfish, or wolfish, is my favorite. Running my fingers through his mouth, I could feel the sharp teeth lining the top and bottom. The powerful jaws enable him to diet on shrimp, lobsters and scallops. As a result, the flesh of the ocean cat is sweet and reminiscent of shellfish.

The last stop of the excursion took us to the smokehouse area and freezer. By this time, fingers and feet were numb, and we begged Tom to finish his speech out in the sunlight. With a small smile of understanding, he agreed.

Next week we go into the Foley kitchen.

Liver lovers make healthy choice

All of you liver lovers out there are wise in your food choice. Liver is one of the richest sources of iron. For instance, a 3-ounce serving of beef liver provides 42 percent of the daily recommended allowance for women during childbearing years.

Liver is, however, high in cholesterol, so don't serve it too often.

Calf and chicken livers are the most popular (pork and lamb are also available.) In purchasing calf's liver, look for a deep, brick colored tint rather than a purple brown color. Kosher is best because the manner of killing results in a more delicate product. Ask your butcher to remove the large veins and the membrane surrounding the outside edges.

With poultry livers, simply remove any greenish spots, which may give your dish a better flavor.

Rinse livers thoroughly in cold water before preparing.

Livers are highly perishable, so keep them refrigerated and use within a day or two after purchase.

Recipes in this column are tested in 625- to 700-watt microwave ovens.

MICROWAVE TIP OF THE WEEK: Chicken livers are easy to saute in a browning dish. Heat browning dish for 4 minutes on HIGH (100 percent power) before adding butter and livers.

LIVER AND MUSHROOMS

1 tablespoon margarine or butter
8 ounces calf's liver, cut in narrow strips
½ medium-size onion, chopped

½ stalk celery, chopped
4 medium-size fresh mushrooms, thinly sliced
½ teaspoon salt
½ teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
½ teaspoon dried oregano
½ teaspoon dried thyme
½ teaspoon dried rosemary
1 tablespoon all-purpose flour
½ cup dry white wine
½ cup dairy sour cream
1 cup hot cooked rice

Yields 2 servings
Preparation time: 10 to 15 minutes

Cooking time: 4 minutes and 45 seconds

Oven setting: HIGH (100 percent power)

Microwave butter or margarine in small microwave-safe casserole for 15 seconds. Remove from oven. Stir in liver, onion, celery and mushrooms. Cover lightly.

Microwave 3 minutes. Remove from oven, stir in salt, pepper, oregano, thyme and rosemary. Set aside.

In one-cup measure, blend flour with wine. Stir into liver mixture and microwave 1 ½ minutes.

Blend in sour cream and serve immediately over hot rice.

SAVORY CHICKEN LIVERS

2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
¼ teaspoon salt
½ teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
½ teaspoon dried rosemary
½ pound chicken livers, cut in

half and drained
4 slices bacon
1 small onion, thinly sliced and separated into rings
1 tablespoon dry sherry
Chopped fresh parsley for garnish

Yields 6 servings
Preparation time: 10 to 15 minutes

Cooking time: 15 minutes, plus 3 minutes standing time.

Oven temperature: HIGH (100 percent power)

In le plate, combine flour, salt, pepper and rosemary. Dredge chicken livers in flour mixture and set aside.

Place bacon in 1 ½ quart browning dish. Cover with paper towel and microwave for three minutes, or until bacon looks crisp. Drain bacon and set aside. Pour off and reserve all but one tablespoon of bacon drippings.

Add onion to drippings remaining in dish, stir to coat. Microwave uncovered for five minutes or until onion is soft, stirring halfway through cooking time. Remove onion from dish and set aside. Wipe dish clean.

Preheat empty browning dish for 3 minutes. Using oven mitts, remove dish to heat-proof surface. Add 1 ½ tablespoons of reserved drippings and tilt dish to coat bottom.

Immediately place chicken livers, not touching, in hot drippings. Be sure drippings coat each liver piece. Wait till sizzling stops, turn livers over and move any pieces that look raw to outside of dish. Sprinkle with sherry. Cover and microwave for 2 minutes. Move any liver pieces that look raw to outside of dish and push

cooked pieces to center. Sprinkle onion over livers. Cover and microwave for two minutes. Cut to test for doneness — all pieces should be pink in center; they will continue to cook while standing. Let stand, covered, for three minutes.

Crumble bacon over livers and garnish with chopped parsley. Serve immediately.

CHICKEN LIVERS IN WINE

½ cup chopped onion
2 tablespoons margarine or butter
1 ½ pounds chicken livers
½ cup dry white wine
3 tablespoons all-purpose flour
2 tablespoons fresh parsley, chopped

¼ teaspoon salt
½ teaspoon freshly ground pepper

Fresh chopped parsley for garnish (optional)

Hot cooked noodles

Yields 4 to 6 servings.

Preparation time: 10 to 15 minutes

Cooking time: 21 to 28 ½ minutes.

Oven setting: HIGH (100 percent power)

Place onion and margarine in 1 ½ quart microwave-safe casserole.

Microwave on HIGH until onion is tender, 2 to 4 ½ minutes.

Stir in remaining ingredients and microwave 19 to 24 minutes at MEDIUM-HIGH until livers are firm and tender, stirring 3 times during cooking.

Serve over hot cooked noodles, garnishing with additional chopped parsley if desired.

New menu gives diners options

With a filled pasta like the cannelloni, you really can't toss it in a pot of boiling water as the filling would simply float away. Therefore, Willerer recommends oven poaching.

The technique is simple. Spray the bottom of a baking pan lightly with oil (Willerer actually keeps extra virgin olive oil handy in a plastic household spray bottle), just enough to keep the pasta from sticking. Then run about a quarter-inch of water in the bottom of the pan. Seal with aluminum foil and bake in a 350 degree oven for 25 minutes or so.

Willerer said he prefers oven poaching over the

stove-top method because it allows greater temperature control, and he can leave it unattended, "so I can answer the phone."

"When you poach something, you have to keep that 160-180 degree temperature," he said. "You really can't control the flame that well. So if you put it in the oven at 350 degrees, it keeps the temperature stable. I poach salmon the same way."

No Italian meal would be complete without pastries for dessert, and that's where Heavenly Bakery really hits its stride. Willerer has spent some time developing a tiramisu cheesecake with a special ingredient.

"I've found this Canadian ricotta that's the crea-

miest ricotta I've ever seen. It's the closest thing I've found to mascarpone cheese, but it's half the price," he said.

Tiramisu, like Southwest style cuisine, has achieved phenomenon status as well. It's an Italian dessert that usually features espresso-soaked lady fingers topped with the creamy mascarpone and chocolate.

"Now people are doing creative things with it, like tiramisu ice cream," Willerer said. "We've got tiramisu cheesecake."

His uses a brownie bottom, topped with a mixture of ricotta and cream cheese that has rum and coffee blended into it.

the browning of foods and of course is essential in making good pickles.

Vinegar has many uses besides pickling and foods, it is being rediscovered as a household helper. Do

not use the flavored, expensive vinegars for household chores. Instead use the cider or white varieties.

Vinegar can make glasses, stainless steel, fish bowls, and windows sparkle. To eliminate odors, and the smoke smell from rooms, fluff blank-

ets, or remove stains on clothing vinegar is a whiz. Vinegar is still used for treatments of rashes, bites and other minor ailments when outside or camping, as it has a soothing healing effect.

Whether you make a specialty

herb vinegar for gifts, purchase some for cooking, or you just need a kitchen helper, vinegar is the answer.





Drag out the crock pot and get out of the kitchen

Too many people fail to take their crockery cooker out of storage for fear that slow-cooking isn't a viable method of cooking the prized roast, game bird or Grandma's trusted spaghetti recipe.

In reality, slow cooking is not only safe, but one of the best ways to have supper at home that isn't carryout—and still be gone all day.

Slow cookers are designed for long cooking periods, says the editor of Better Homes & Gardens' "Crockery Cooker Cookbook." Food heats very slowly, particularly on the lowest setting. If the low setting is used for meat and egg mixtures, they must be cooked at least six hours (high setting, three hours). Less than that and the food won't get hot enough to be sure of destroying bacteria.

Mary Berry, author of "Crockery Cookbook," agrees. "From a health point of view, there are no hazards (to crockery cookers). You should still, however, use common sense. Do not, for example, attempt to cook a frozen chicken in the pot without making certain it has thawed completely in the refrigerator first."

Extensive research has been carried out by manufacturers to ensure that the cooking process destroys all harmful bacteria.

Of more danger is storing food at room temperature before or after cooking, or storing food, even in the refrigerator, in a traditional, heavy ceramic crockery cooker itself. It's best to store ingredients for advance preparation in another container in the refrigerator, then transfer them to the crockery cooker for cooking, and once the food has cooked, to remove it and store in another container in the refrigerator. That's because the crockery cooker is so heavy it insulates food, preventing it from getting cold quickly.

In addition, condensation on the electrical parts may interfere with proper performance. Sudden changes in temperature also can

damage the ceramic liner of the cooker.

There are new varieties of cookers, such as Corningware, that are designed to go from crockery cooker to freezer or microwave, but in general, it's a good idea to store food in another container before or after cooking if your crockery cooker is made of glazed clay, stainless steel, porcelain or baked enamel.

Once in the crockery cooker, the danger is undercooking, not overcooking.

"Since you simply cannot overcook the food, it doesn't matter one bit if the dish cooks on high for up to two hours longer than mentioned in the recipe or on low for up to four hours longer," says Berry. "However, it is perfectly possible to undercook."

Peeking at the dish while it cooks, a temptation almost too hard to resist, can add up to 15 to 20 minutes cooking time per peek. And it rarely gives much information. The cooking temperature is so low, there's little movement of the liquid or veggies.

A few other hints: Stick to the liquid called for in the recipe even though it is usually less than you would normally use. There is no loss of liquid during cooking with a slow cooker because there isn't any evaporation. For adapting recipes, the general rule is to cut the normal quantity of liquid in half.

Dairy ingredients, like sour cream, should be added at the end. Prolonged cooking causes them to separate. Ditto for noodles. Personal experience has taught me the crockery cooker and noodles aren't a happy marriage, at least when macaroni noodles are allowed to slow-cook for more than an hour. They turn to mush. Noodles, it turns out, need to be cooked on the stove, then added to a crockery cooker the final 10 minutes.

Don't worry about leaving the crockery cooker unattended. It cooks slowly so no steam escapes. If you follow the recipe, food will not burn.

Different settings on the crockery cooker offer flexibility. At a higher setting, foods may be ready in two to three hours, while on low these dishes may need twice the cooking time—a bonus if you'll be away all day.

For better color and flavor, brown meats and other ingredients in a frypan before you place them with liquid and seasonings into the crockery cooker.

Sauces may be thin, because steam hasn't escaped and they have not been allowed to reduce. To heighten flavor and improve appearance, boil sauces down on top of the range just before serving or thicken them with flour.

When making stews, place vegetables under meat because they tend to cook more slowly in crockery cookers and the highest heat is at the bottom of the pot.

Foods that are cooked on the low setting may need more seasoning because they haven't been allowed to reduce. Experiment. Then adjust seasoning at the end.

A crockery cooker cooks more efficiently when it is half full.

Some cooks rarely leave the house for work without filling the crockery cooker. With children and full-time jobs, they find it one of the best time-savers in the kitchen.

One idea is to cook a whole chicken in the crockery cooker (with salt, pepper, onion flakes, parsley and crushed red pepper) while at work, then take it out to cool as soon as you arrive home. For supper, remove the chicken from the bone, add it back to the stock with cooked rice and let it simmer for chicken and rice soup.

Another time-saver is to let pork chops or cube steak cook all day with a can of cream of mushroom soup in the crockery cooker. The chops are tender, have their own gravy, and can be served with rice and a vegetable for a quick dinner.

To cook a roast in the crockery cooker, peel potatoes and carrots, layer them in the bottom of the crockery cooker, cover them with water,

then place the roast on top, add seasonings and let cook all day.

The crockery cooker can also be used for making Swiss steak by adding a can of tomatoes and seasonings to the meat.

The crockery cooker is one way to cook chicken pieces for chicken noodle soup. Cover the pieces with water, add water, a cut-up onion, parsley, poultry seasoning, celery salt, basil, and a few other vegetables, such as cut-up carrots or celery, and cook it on low while you're at work. Back at home, take the meat out, remove the bones and pour the broth into a pan on the stove. When it comes to a hard boil, add noodles, then when they're done, add the chicken back.

To prepare a roast, cut up fresh mushrooms, layer vegetables such as potatoes, carrots and onions, add the roast, and sprinkle Lipton's onion-mushroom soup mix over it. Very little water is added because as the meat and vegetables cook, they generate their own juices.

Hot cooked rice
1/4 cup cold water
2 tablespoons cornstarch

Yields 4 servings.
Trim fat from steaks. In skillet, cook trimmings until about 2 tablespoons fat accumulates. Discard trimmings. Brown steaks on both sides in hot fat. Season with basil, salt and pepper.

Drain peach slices; reserve syrup. Place peaches in crockery cooker; place meat atop. Combine reserved peach syrup, vinegar and bouillon granules; pour over steaks. Cover and cook on low-heat setting for 8 hours.

Arrange steaks and peaches over rice on platter and keep warm. Garnish with parsley, if desired.

Skim excess fat. In saucepan, blend cold water into cornstarch and stir in hot liquid. Cook and stir until thickened and bubbly. Serve with steaks.

OLD-FASHIONED BEEF STEW

2 pounds beef stew meat, cut into 1 1/2-inch cubes
1 1/2 cup flour
2 tablespoons oil
1 bay leaf
1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce

1 onion, chopped
1 cup beef bouillon
1/4 teaspoon pepper
2 teaspoons salt
1 teaspoon sugar
6 carrots, peeled and sliced or quartered

1 cup sliced celery
4 potatoes, peeled and cut into eighths
12 small white onions
2 medium turnips, peeled and quartered (optional)
4 cups water
1 cup cooked okra (optional)

Yields 6 to 8 servings.
Coat meat with flour; set brown meat on all sides. In crockery cooker,

combine browned beef, bay leaf, Worcestershire sauce, chopped onion, bouillon, pepper, salt, sugar and vegetables.

Pour water over all. Cover and cook on low 8 to 10 hours. Turn up to high. Thicken with leftover flour dissolved in a bit of water. Add okra if desired. Cover and cook on high 10 to 15 minutes or until slightly thickened.

SWISS STEAK IN WINE SAUCE

1 (2-pound) beef round steak, cut 1-inch thick
2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
2 teaspoons salt
1 teaspoon freshly ground pepper
2 tablespoons cooking oil
1 cup chopped onion
1/2 cup sliced carrot
2 tablespoons chopped green pepper
1 (16-ounce) can tomatoes, cut up
1/4 cup Burgundy
1 clove garlic, minced
1 teaspoon sugar
Wine sauce

Yields 6 servings.
Trim fat from steak; cut into 6 equal pieces. Coat with mixture of flour, salt and pepper. Pound steak to 1/4-inch thickness using meat mallet. Brown meat in hot oil and drain.

Place onion, carrot and green pepper in crockery cooker. Place meat atop. Add mixture of undrained tomatoes, Burgundy, garlic and sugar. Cover and cook on low setting 8 to 10 hours.

Place meat and vegetables on serving platter. Reserve 1/4 cup cooking liquid for wine sauce. Spoon some sauce over meat and pass remaining. To make wine sauce, pour reserved liquid into saucepan. Blend 1/4 cup cold water slowly into 2 tablespoons flour. Stir into liquid. Cook and stir until thickened and bubbly.

CARROT AND ZUCCHINI BARS

1 1/4 cups all-purpose flour
1/2 cup packed brown sugar
1 teaspoon baking powder
1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
1/2 teaspoon baking soda
2 slightly beaten eggs
1 1/2 cups shredded carrot
1 medium zucchini, shredded (1 cup)

1/2 cup raisins
1/2 cup chopped walnuts
1/2 cup cooking oil
1/2 cup honey
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 recipe Citrus Cream Cheese Frosting

In a large mixing bowl stir together flour, brown sugar, baking powder, ginger and baking soda. In another large mixing bowl stir together eggs, carrot, zucchini, raisins, walnuts, oil, honey and vanilla. Add carrot mixture to flour mixture; stir just until combined.

Spread the batter in an ungreased 13-by-9-by-2-inch baking pan. Bake in a 350-degree F oven about 25 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in

Revved-up Grieco hits

Richard Grieco's been in the fast lane for quite a while now. In high school, he played hockey and lacrosse and was named an All American in football. He went to college on an athletic scholarship, but soon left the slow pace of academia to try his luck at modeling in New York City. Quickly signed by the prestigious Elite agency, Grieco appeared in ads for Chanel, Giorgio Armani and Calvin Klein before he switched paths again, this time deciding to become an actor.

Once more, success was not long in coming. His very first television audition led to a year-long stint in the daytime drama "One Life to Live," after which Grieco moved to Los Angeles. There, guest shots in "Rags to Riches" and "Who's the Boss" propelled him into the Fox network's popular "21 Jump Street" series. His good looks and dashing demeanor made him so popular, he was given his own spinoff series, "Booker."

The big screen has beckoned to Grieco as well, offering him starring roles in "If Looks Could Kill" and "Mobsters." He's slated to star in his own CBS series late this year, and is negotiating the publication of a volume of original poetry titled "Fragments in a Dirty Ashtray."

But the handsome performer's latest work, a high-octane drama titled "Born to Run," roars into view Monday, Aug. 2, on Fox. Directed by Albert Magnoli ("Purple Rain," "Tango & Cash"), the film stars Grieco as quiet Nicky Donatello, a young man who still lives at home, working in his widowed father's small grocery. But on Friday nights, for a few adrenaline-charged moments, Nicky feels truly alive. Gifted with mechanical prowess and a steely calm behind the wheel, Nicky is the toast of the local drag strip. Despite the best efforts of arrogant Phil Landi (Joe Cortese), a small-time crime boss who controls all gambling at the strip, Nicky just can't be beat.

But Phil knows the way to get to Nicky is through his luckless brother Richie (Jay Avacone), a chronic gambler (and loser) who takes the meager profits from his used-car lot to pay his mounting debts. Still, he can't keep up and one day discovers he owes Phil a dismaying \$12,000. Fearful for his life, Richie defies his brother's stern orders and bets everything he has on Nicky's next race.

But "Born to Run," written by Randall M. Badat and Frank Bidetto, is more than just one drag race, and the Donatello brothers find themselves caught in a vortex

of violence and treachery. Ultimately, Nicky knows it's up to him to save both his brother's life and his own future.

Grieco wisely eschews many of the threadbare mannerisms a character like Nicky might suggest, avoiding movie rebels' customary screaming and posturing for an understated, gentle portrayal. His performance instead suggests a restless, quiet child, just wanting to find his niche. Jay Avacone is effective as Richie and Joe Cortese is colorful in his portrayal of Phil, although he tends to overact in the more intense moments. Christian Campbell makes the most of his small role as the teen-age mechanic who idolizes Nicky.

Shelli Lether, on the other hand, is little more than set dressing as Sally, the Manhattan model who leaves her perch on Phil's arm for Nicky's bed. Her shrill cries of "I believed in you" are startlingly amateurish.

But then, what might one do with such shopworn dialogue? Badat and Bidetto have devised a complicated, interesting story, but saddle their actors with lines few thespians could deliver convincingly.

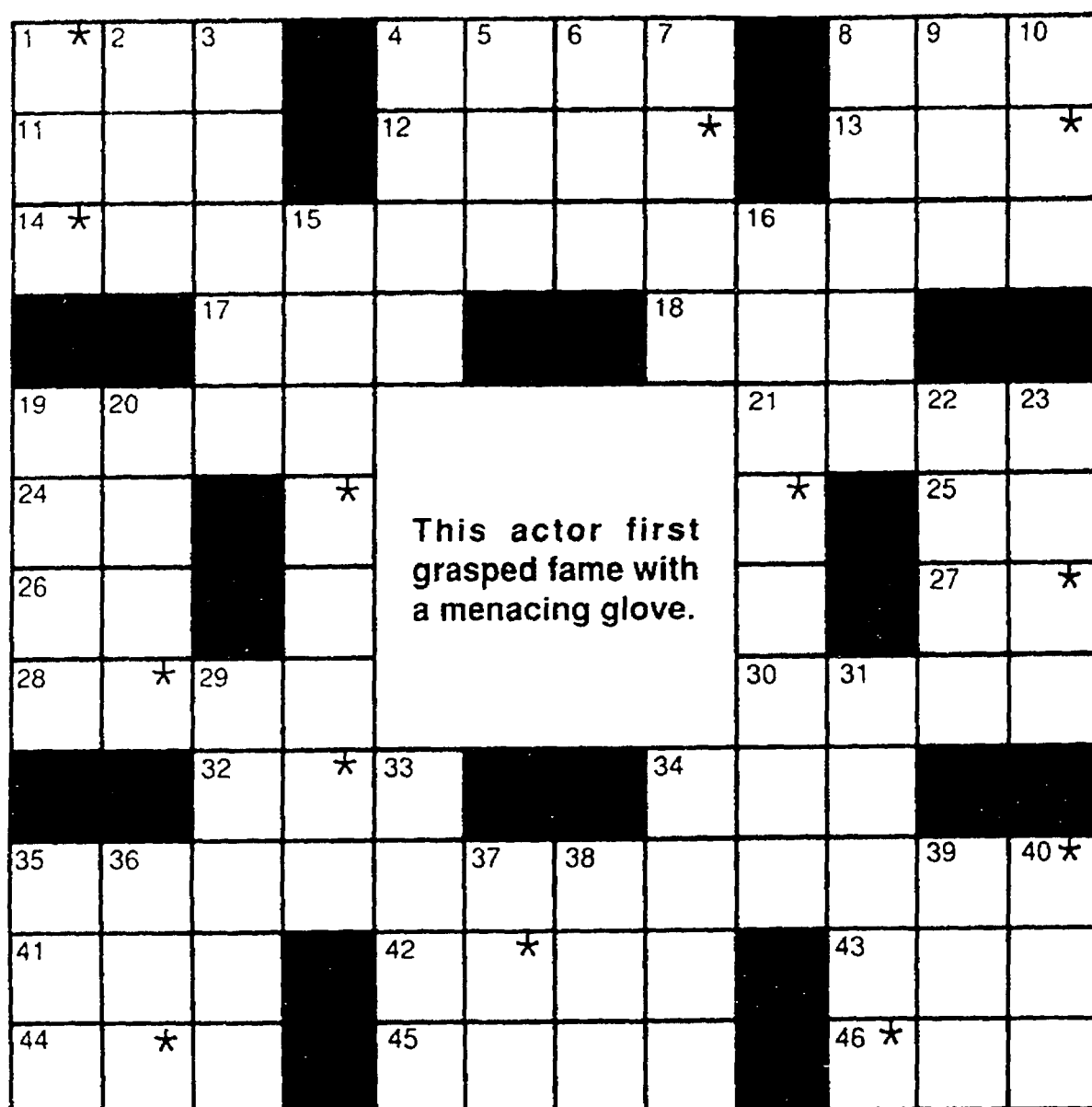

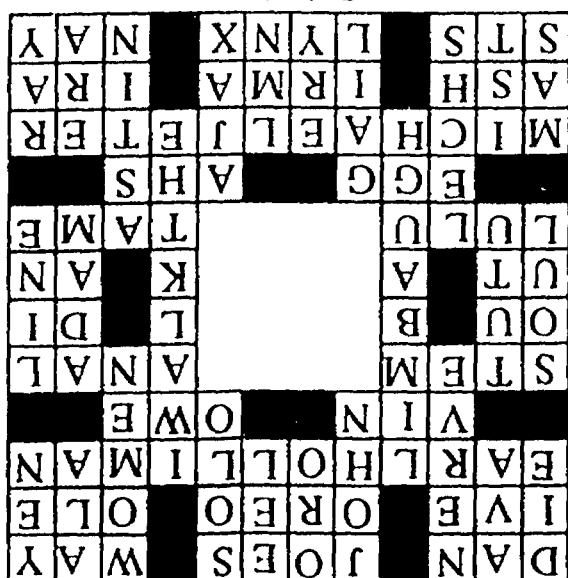

"Daytime is an excellent training ground for a younger actor. There is so much to learn from the people who work here, especially the ones who have been here a long time. The place runs like a machine, and it amazes me how much is accomplished each day."

Working in daytime means long hours for Muldoon, so how does he kick back and relax? He goes to acting classes. "I am involved in an acting studio, and that pretty much takes up all my time off." He does take some time to get together with a group friends and jam. They have a small band called Hard News, "but it is all just for fun."

Muldoon lives in what he calls a "box," but there is a reason for that. "People would be surprised to know what a slob I am," says Muldoon. "If you saw my dressing room or home you would understand. I'm not the neatest guy in the world, so I am happy to have four walls, a desk, stereo and bed. There is a lot less for me to clean up."
