Water main bursts, traffic rerouted

Main Street between Griswold and Cady was closed for several hours Thursday as city Department of Public Works employees labored to repair a 4-foot-long split along an 8-inch water main.

The failure was attributed to the

City police first were notified of the break and ensuing flooding at 3:11 a.m. Thursday. By 9 a.m., DPW workers had the road torn up in front of the vacant Ford Valve Plant and were pumping water out of the hole.

"It was coming out all over," said DPW Foreman Paul Vertrees. "The pipe was fed by a new 12-inch main and the water was coming downhill at a lot of pressure, and it just blew the side right out of the pipe."

While repairs were under way water was shut off to several surrounding buildings, including Mill Stream Apartments, Mr. Glow Car

Wash and Kelly & Kelly P.C. Workers had replaced a 6-foot section of the pipe by 1 p.m.

DPW Spokesperson Becky Dozier said the water service was restored by 2:30 p.m. as workers continued cleaning up the scene.

"Everybody was home by 3:45," Dozier said.

Township OKs higher millage

Property taxes to go up

Northville Township property owners will see an increase in their taxes as a result of action taken by the board of trustees Aug. 12.

The board voted 4-3 to approve a resolution allowing the township to collect taxes based on millage rates previously approved by township voters.

The result will be a projected increase in property taxes of \$28.31 for people with homes worth \$124,500, and \$51.60 for homeowners whose houses are valued at \$227,020.

The tax hike, effective with the winter bill, represents an increase of roughly 12 percent on existing property. Another 3.3 percent in additional revenues will come into the township treasury from new construction.

Township Finance Director Dwayne Harrigan explained that the apparently large increase was due to

the township's failure to capture even minimal tax increases dating back to 1987. The Headlee Amendment to the state constitution allows municipalities to collect additional taxes equal to the previous year's inflation rate.

The new millage rate of 4.03 mills is still below the rate voters have authorized the township to levy, though it is the maximum allowable this year under Headlee, Harrigan said.

He added the township millage represents only about 8 percent of the overall tax bill of township residents. The majority of the roughly 50 mills on which residents pay taxes goes to the public school district, with other dollars going to Wayne County and to Schoolcraft College.

The township's total budget amounts to roughly \$3.8 million.

In the past, the township has not collected the maximum amount of taxes allowable by law, resulting, ac-

Officials to study joining police, fire

Consolidating Northville Township's police and fire departments is an idea that's at least worthy of further study, in the opinion of township elected officials.

The township board of trustees voted 4-3 Thursday to table a request to consolidate the two departments and will take up the issue again at a study session Aug. 19.

The board showed guarded interest in the proposal, put forward by township Manager Bill Richards. The plan would retain separate budgets and responsibilities for the two departments, but merge administrative duties and reassign four employees into a single department of public safety.

The written proposal includes possible staff realignment of four individuals: promoting Police Chief Chip

Snider to Public Safety Director, with a salary increase to be determined at a later date, re-assigning Fire Chief Rick Roselle to function as chief operating officer of the Fire Division, re-assigning Deputy Fire Chief Bill Zimendak as chief administrative officer of the Fire Division, and re-assigning administrative assistant Paula Sherman to function as clerical/administrative support for the Public Safety Department.

Keeping the employees' former titles was a question of some confusion as Supervisor Karen Baja noted the board does not want to create confusion or the illusion that anyone is being demoted.

"This is not to be interpreted as a criticism of the way the fire department puts out fires or the quality of the personnel," she said. "It's simply a way to look administratively at how

Parking plan for Woolly Bully's rejected

of 182 spaces on the lot.

The lot now has 77 spaces, but township ordinances would require 164 spaces if the restaurant was built today. Under a proposed parking ordinance reviewed by the planners Tuesday night, a new development of Woolly Bully's size would require 205 spaces.

Roman's plan required variances for extending into the required greenbelt, noncompliance with township parking space and aisle width standards and landscaping along the east property line.

Roman noted that the parking was designed to allow as much room for landscaping as possible, but said he was open to other options.

He also noted that he has signed contracts with CSX Railroad to lease the 100-foot strip of railroad easement for the land needed to expand his lot, and with Northville Research Center for overflow parking across Seven Mile from the restaurant.

Planning Commissioner Russ Fogg objected to the removal of trees in front of the property, even though they are not considered high-quality trees by township consultants.

"I've got a feeling for the trees, box elders or not," Fogg said. "I hate to see trees go down due to the fact that two people can't get together and come to an agreement."

The remark referred to Roman's inability to reach a parking agree-

ment with Highland Lakes owner Bill Autry, who fenced off Roman's lot after charging that Woolly Bully customers were taking up spaces needed for other stores.

Other audience members objected to the tree removal, including Northrop Funeral Home owner John Sassaman and Catherine Sellas of the Northville Beautification Commission. It was noted that the township has been designated a "tree city," and that the removal of that many trees hardly lived up to that designation.

Roman and Autry exchanged a few words themselves Tuesday night when Autry raised the parking dis-

Library decision stalled over parking questions

run along West Cady and straddle the hill between city hall and the Northville Recreation Center. The site was first considered for a new library in 1976. Northville Public Schools would need to approve the site since part of the building would sit on school-owned land.

School Supt. Dr. Leonard Rezmierski asked at a July 30 meeting whether enough parking could be provided for the new facility, and wondered what the impact would be on school functions.

But Mayor Pro Tem Carolann Ayers urged the board last Tuesday not to be discouraged by parking requirements.

"You should not let parking be an absolute brick wall," she said. "You can always go to the zoning board for

School lunch prices set to increase

Northville public school students will see slight increases in food prices as they wait in the lunch line this school year.

School officials are hoping appetites increase, too.

"We did experience a deficit last year," said David Bolitho, assistant superintendent for administrative

services. "In order to cover that deficit, we needed to raise prices."

The biggest jumps in the prices for meals will be at the Early Childhood Program and Center Programs (Bryant and Old Village special education schools) for ages 3-5 where lunch increases 20 cents to \$1.70.

The Northville Board of Education also approved the following food service lunch prices for the 1993-94 school year:

● Early Childhood Center Lunch, \$1.70, reflects a 13 percent increase from last year's price of \$1.50.

Snack, 60 cents, a 9 percent increase from last year's charge of 55 cents.

Breakfast, 90 cents, a 12.5 percent increase from the 80 cent charge last year.

Schools to charge for records

Northville Board of Education members approved last Monday night the first reading of a policy governing requests for public records.

The school district's attorney Thomas Schwarz suggested at a recent policy sub-committee the district adopt such a policy which will include guidelines for accessing public records. The policy also spells out that residents seeking copies of public records will be charged for duplication and labor costs.

"The law says you can charge for the actual cost of duplication," Schwarz told board members.

In addition, the school district may also charge a fee for the "labor costs of search, examination, review, and the deletion and separation of exempt from non exempt information if the failure to charge a fee would result in unreasonably high costs to the school district because of the nature of the request in that particular instance."

"A request for a public record or series of public records which will take more than one hour in labor time to search, examine, review and delete and separate from non exempt information shall be considered to be an unreasonably high cost to the school district."

Labor costs will be calculated at the hourly wage of the lowest paid, full-time, permanent clerical employee of the district.

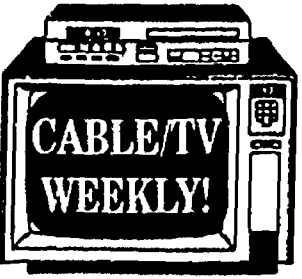
If a fee exceeds \$50, the district may also require a "good faith" deposit from the person seeking the public

a variance . . . There are many options."

Library Director Pat Orr became upset when the board discussed putting off a decision, saying that she needs to know which way the board wants to proceed so she can formulate a proposed budget for district library operations.

"You're putting me in a tough position because you're going to want a budget from me and I can't do it," she said. "We've got to know, are we budgeting for downstairs (for a new facility)?"

The board agreed to make a decision at its Sept. 2 site committee study session, and bring city and township finance officials along to review the finances.

Northville Township Trustee Gini

Britton, liaison to the library board, threw another factor into the equation Tuesday when she mentioned that the township still is seeking municipal space in the state-owned Wayne Community Living Services building at Five Mile and Sheldon.

"There was a library on that site," Britton noted. "Whether we want to consider that or not, I'm just telling you this because we were talking about that site . . . If this school site falls through, that's a possibility."

Board Member Fran Mattison said she feared that raising the possibility of another library site could derail the Cady Street plan, like the Haller Library proposal squelched talk of a new facility at one of several other sites before it was defeated by township voters in 1990.

A district library serves more than one community and has its own direct, dedicated voter-approved mil-

lage. State law allows a district library board to seek between 1-2 mills for operating expenses and, if necessary, site acquisition and construction.

Northville's board, formed earlier this year, has until May 1 of next year to obtain voter approval of a dedicated millage.

The board plans to submit a millage request to the electorate sometime after Dec. 1.

Britton asked if the May 1 date could be extended to combine the millage request with an already-scheduled August primary election, but the suggestion met with little favor from voting board members.

"We have sat here and we've pitched this around since February," said board member Anna Sarkisian. "It's my opinion pushing it off to August will only aggravate the situation further. Let's get on with it and do it."

pute and said his attorney had offered the restaurant owner the use of up to 200 spaces in the shopping center.

"We're going to negotiate the parking here with Mr. Autry tonight as well?" Roman asked. "He's got 200 (spaces) for \$7,500 a month if you want to hear facts, OK?"

"We're here to talk about this site plan," acting Chairman John Amos

insisted as he directed the conversation back to Roman's requests.

Though at least one planner praised Roman for his creativity, the commission seemed concerned over the number of variances required to make it work.

"We have a project that's entirely built around variances, and they're not minor variances, they're significant variances," said Amos.

Amos criticized the plan's small green belt and the parking lot's engineering and turning radiuses, and said he was reluctant to pass the plan under the condition that it receive the necessary variances and dump it in the lap of the Zoning Board of Appeals.

Youth stones car from overpass

A 9-year-old Northville boy was arrested by city police after allegedly throwing a rock onto the windshield of a car heading west on Eight Mile Aug. 9. The boy was standing on the high school overpass with a friend at 2:40 p.m. when the incident occurred.

The victim, a Bloomfield Hills man, told police he was driving under the overpass when he noticed the boy throw something and saw his windshield shatter. His arm was cut by the broken glass. The man pulled over and yelled to the two boys as they were running from the scene, and the 9-year-old came back and admitted throwing the rock.

The man told the boy to get in his truck, then took him to the Northville Wine Shoppe farther west on Eight Mile where he called police. Police came to the scene to investigate and placed the boy in custody.

When the boy's mother was called into the station, she threatened to sue the man for "abducting" her son and seemed less concerned about the rock-throwing incident. The police officer who investigated the case told her he was satisfied that the man had apprehended, not abducted, her son.

The woman eventually agreed to pay \$283 in restitution to cover the cost of replacing the man's windshield, and he agreed to drop felony charges against her son.

INDECENT EXPOSURE: An 8-year-old Northville girl told city police that a man exposed himself to her while she was walking along Yerkes Avenue Aug. 10. The girl said she was walking to a friend's house about 7 p.m. when the man crossed the street behind her, following her. She said she turned around and noticed that the man had pulled his shorts to one side to expose his genitals. He then ran east on Johnson Avenue until she lost sight of him.

The man was described as a white male between 30-35 years old, with dark hair and standing 5-foot, 10-inches tall. He was wearing a white t-shirt, blue shorts and white tennis shoes.

MEIJER SHOPLIFTER CAUGHT: A Meijer store detective told township police she saw a 54-year-old Plymouth woman shove \$48 in merchandise into her purse before attempting to leave the store the afternoon of Aug. 5. The woman had taken two rotary cutters, three blades, a box of bandages, tincture and a ball. Police cited her on the spot for larceny, and a court date was set.

SERIOUS ACCIDENT: Three people were reported injured in an Aug. 7 traffic accident at Five Mile and Haggerty. The crash occurred just after midnight when a Farmington Hills man, 21, ran a flashing red

DRUNKEN DRIVING ARREST: Township police cited a Canton man, 47, for driving under the influence Aug. 8 after stopping him for running a red light at Northville Road and Six Mile just after midnight. The man, who told police he thought he was on Seven Mile, failed field sobriety tests and was arrested. His blood alcohol level was measured at .14 percent. He was released at 7:40 a.m. after sobering up and posting a personal bond.

LARCENY FROM CAR: A Reed Court resident reported the theft of a purse and contents valued at \$210 from a car parked in her driveway between 10:15 p.m. Aug. 9 and 6:30 a.m. Aug. 10. The brown leather Coach purse contained a black leather Liz Claiborne wallet, two credit cards and two \$5 bills.

The resident was uncertain whether the car was locked at the time, and there were no signs of forced entry.

WARRANT ARREST: City police discovered that a 33-year-old Northville Township man stopped at Mill Race Historical Village late Aug. 10 had a warrant for his arrest. The man was wanted by Northville Township police for contempt of court stemming from a prior drunken driving charge. He was turned over to township police at the scene.

record. The deposit shall not, however, exceed half of the total fee.

If a person seeking such records can prove he is unable to pay because of indigence, or is receiving public assistance, the district will furnish the record without charge for the first \$20 of the fee for each request. In addition, the superintendent has sole

discretion as to whether records will be furnished without or at a reduced charge.

Although the policy does not set a price structure, it does provide a means for calculating one. In a recent response to an Freedom of Information Act request on behalf of resident Bob Bernard, Supt. Leonard Dziemski estimated it cost the district 75 cents a page to duplicate records.

He based that figure on a 15-cent charge per copy and \$8 per hour for clerical work.

"A lot of public agencies charge \$4 or \$5 a page," Schwarze said. "... I don't know where people get their figures from."

Dolly McMaster, assistant superintendent for instructional services, said she felt the policy would play "hardball" with people who abused

the system intended to protect the rights of public access.

"I think our direction to the administration has been that we've always been open," board secretary Glenna Davis said at the sub-committee meeting.

The district's new policy is in accordance with the Michigan Freedom of Information Act.

things might be better organized."

Richards stressed the proposal would centralize departmental budget development and administration, optimize administrative knowledge and personnel and streamline the chain of command from public safety to administration, among other benefits.

He stated both the township police and fire chiefs support the proposal, which is based on similar nominally-consolidated public safety departments in Canton and Pittsfield townships.

Trustee Russel Fogg's motion to table, however, was backed by a majority of the board when he suggested the measure warrants a more in-depth study before an informed decision could be made.

The board voted 4-3 to table the request pending clarification of issues, particularly concerns raised by Trustee Gini Britton and Clerk Sue Hillebrand.

"Frankly, I'm very uncomfortable with this," said Britton. "It sounds

good, but we haven't analyzed if this is a direction the board wants the township to travel in."

Britton also raised concern over the proposed consolidation's effect on the possible shared services agreement among the five municipalities of Northville Township, Northville city, Plymouth, Township, Plymouth city and Canton Township. Concerns about union reaction were also expressed.

Hillebrand echoed Britton's reservations, noting, "I think this is a drastic change. I'm not entirely opposed to us working toward a public safety department, but I'm hesitant to change a structure and not know how it'll affect the millage, how it will affect the unions and how we will pay for a possible pay increase."

Baja said the consolidation shouldn't upset the proposal for shared services, because the township's police and fire functions would remain separate, even though their administrative aspects would be merged.

The Aug. 19 study session is scheduled for 7 p.m.

cording to the proposal, in "a statutory erosion of the Township's ability to collect taxes at previously voter-approved millage rates."

The proposal language goes on to say that this practice has resulted in several years of technically balanced budgets at the expense of dipping into the township's fund contingency.

Following the Aug. 12 truth-in-taxation public hearing, the board's discussion centered around the state of the township's fund balance and the advisability of using the maximum-allowable tax rate to aid the financially strapped township, as opposed to making spending cuts or implementing other means of revenue enhancement.

Trustee Mark Abbo disapproved of the proposal, noting, "I'm opposed to the tax increase. The literature indicates this is not a tax increase, but I disagree. An increase in millage is an increase in tax and we should learn to live within our means."

Board treasurer Rick Engelland agreed, saying, "I don't believe a tax increase of 12 percent is justified in today's economic times. Taxes have been raised twice in the last 10 years, and both times our fund balance went down."

Also voting against the proposal was Trustee Barbara O'Brien. Voting in favor were Supervisor Karen Baja, Clerk Sue Hillebrand, and trustees Russ Fogg and Gini Britton.

Britton was careful to stress that additional revenues from the increased millage should be earmarked for the fund balance.

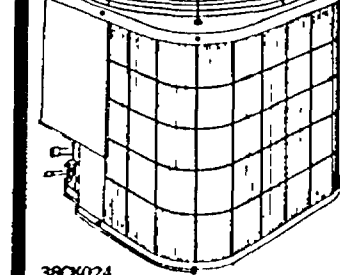
"We don't know what the Legislature is going to do and we need to look at our long-term financial situation," she said.

Baja concurred, noting that the township cannot continue to count on such sources of revenue as 35th District Court, which, she pointed out, is one of only a few money-making courts in the state.

"We were voted the right to collect this millage and we should do it," she said.

Resolve is needed to fix parking problem

The Northville Township Planning Commission last week turned thumbs down to Mark Roman's request for the construction of additional parking spaces at Woolly Bully's, Roman's popular rock 'n' roll club/diner on Seven Mile.

Given the horrendous parking problems that have made life miserable for Roman and for tenants of the adjacent Highland Lakes Shopping Center since Woolly Bully's opened last March, it might seem unreasonable to trash a plan that could have helped ease the situation. It wasn't.

Roman's request was a radical one, and would have required the use of no less than five variances. The proposal asked commissioners to permit the felling of 71 trees and waive the usual requirements regulating space and width specifications. In addition, the parking lot extension would have left only a small green belt between the lot line and the CSX railroad tracks.

Instead of trying to shoehorn more parking into an already cramped location, we believe what is needed to solve the space problem in the shopping center is a little cooperation between the two warriors in the parking battle, Roman and Highland Lakes owner Bill Autry.

The irateness between Autry and Roman has escalated so far out of control that each now seems more concerned with finding creative ways of humiliating

his adversary than with coming up with ideas on how to end the stalemate.

Given that the peak hours of Woolly Bully's do not coincide with the hours of operation of most Highland Lakes' tenants, we find it hard to believe that an agreement to share the lot can't be reached.

But first, the two sides must adopt a good faith attitude and sit down at the table to hash things out. It wouldn't be the most pleasant get together anyone's ever been to, but it could be a productive one if there is firm resolve on the part of both parties.

In the meantime, township officials must revisit their ordinance governing parking arrangements and make sure nothing like this ever happens again. You don't put a carnival in a driveway and you shouldn't start an entertainment superstore without enough parking to accommodate the droves who will show up.

Move to delete code provision was smart

The Northville Board of Education last week wisely deleted from the district's Student Code of Conduct a prohibition against the wearing of clothes and accessories that could have been "reasonably perceived" as gang insignia.

Had the language been left in the code, teachers, administrators and even students would have had broad latitude in interpreting styles of dress as evidence of possible gang involvement.

Board members alertly came to view this provision as excessive and potentially unfair to large numbers of students who use the way they dress and style their hair as an outlet of creative expression.

Equally important was the board's decision to include in the code language authorizing disciplinary action against students engaging in gang conduct such as violence, intimidation, or membership recruitment. Proof of such behavior can result in anything from administrative intervention to expulsion.

We, like school district officials, have been alarmed by recent reports of gang activity spreading to the suburbs. Reports indicate that gang members are attempting to extend their reach into the outlying areas and are finding shopping

malls convenient places to meet youths who are receptive to the gang message of law-defying excitement.

But we would caution against over-reaction. The Northville community is an unlikely breeding grounds for full-scale gang activity and there is certainly no need to brand students who dress outlandishly as gang potential. Were that the case, practically half the high school student population could come under suspicion.

TRUTH IN TALKSATION: Kudos to Northville Township Trustee Mark Abbo for calling a spade a spade. At Thursday's meeting, Manager Bill Richards recommended that the board of trustees increase the township levy. The motion passed and now property taxes will go up by about \$51 on a home valued at \$227,000.

As only a bureaucrat can, Richards found a way to avoid calling the request a tax hike. "For accuracy sake, this matter does not represent a tax increase," he wrote in his memorandum to the board.

Abbo, less schooled than Richards in the Byzantine language of the professional administrator, helped restore clarity, saying, essentially, "yes it does."

We're getting bathrooms! We're getting bathrooms!

That's the gleeful cry around the Motorsports Museum and Hall of Fame of America. Now before you classify me as some pea-brained twit along the lines of Steve Martin in *The Jerk*, who got excited when the phone book came out with his name in it, let me put this in perspective for you.

Another construction project I should announce, albeit a little belatedly, is that the Museum will also soon be wired for cable television. If the logic escapes you, let me explain.

Visitors to the museum are most plentiful on the weekends. Unfortunately, that's when most racing coverage is broadcast. The bulk of racing coverage is presented on cable-only channels like The Nashville Network and ESPN. We'd like to show the races so our visitors won't miss a minute of their favorite sport.

Video displays are already a part of the museum, showing early racing footage, old racing movies and racing music videos, so the monitors are already in place. Getting cable in was the hard part.

Remember what I said before about how you can drive a car across the building? Now imagine what kind of a task it would be to string cable through that big of a structure.

We can tell you how much it would cost: \$10,000. But thanks to the folks at South West Oakland Cable Commission, it won't cost us anything. They're picking up the tab to bring us cable, a donation for which we will be forever grateful.

The funny part is, we'll probably have cable before we have bathrooms, which shows you where a race fan's priorities lie.

The letter struck me as interesting, but it also made me feel like responding because I think pictures like that have a very important place in community newspapers.

That's why I would like to try to explain why I believe that pictures of boys playing street hockey in their driveways is an important part of the service we provide Novi and Northville residents on the pages of *The Novi News* and *The Northville Record*.

A community newspaper serves a wide variety of functions. Mr. Radecki is absolutely correct when he states that the primary responsibility of the local newspaper is to inform residents of the news taking place in their hometowns.

What's happening at the city council meetings . . . what's happening at the school board or planning commissions is of paramount importance to the residents and we have a responsibility to provide it for them.

I also believe that good hometown newspapers play an important sociological role in helping provide a sense of identity and unity for a community.

It sometimes strikes me that there are relatively few unify-

ing factors in many contemporary communities which often are comprised of a series of subdivisions.

A good hometown newspaper, I believe, is extremely important in bringing all those individual subdivisions together and providing a broader sense of community. Want to spend an interesting afternoon some time?

Come into our office and look through the pages of *The Northville Record* 10, 20, 30, 40 and 50 years ago. It's fascinating to look at the old pictures of what life was like in Northville over the years.

I think you'll get a kick out of seeing how people dressed 50 years ago . . . and what they did for leisure time activities.

As an editor, I believe that one of my responsibilities is to build that historical record . . . to chronicle through words and pictures what life was like in Northville for future generations to see.

And that's why I feel compelled to rush to the defense of pictures of kids playing street hockey in their driveways. Or people watching the band concerts on Friday nights in Northville.

It's a picture of ourselves . . . not only for us, but for future generations as well.

Dump fast food and try some good food fast

Hectic lifestyles makes it very tempting to plan dinner around a bucket of chicken, a bag of burgers or a frozen boxed dinner. Fast foods can dent the budget and may shortchange you nutritionally.

Most families are "into" lighter meals, easier preparation of foods, and faster cleanup. Time-consuming cooking (other than holidays) has really passed its prime. "Foods fast" as opposed to "fast foods" may be the perfect solution.

"Foods fast" preparation does not mean defrost and cook a frozen TV dinner or open a box. Instead, use your imagination! The key to quick and easy nutritious meals is organization. Start by planning menus. Think about how much time you have for preparation, cooking and cleanup.

Have a well stocked kitchen of food staples, the basics, such as flour, sugar, rice, shortening and pasta so you can immediately put together a meal. Always have some "no cook" foods handy. These are canned fish, canned vegetables and fruits, for a hot or cold meal. Streamline shopping by planning ahead for several meals and do the shopping all at one time.

Look at what convenience appliances you may have in your kitchen. The biggest time-saver is a microwave, the cooking time is cut in half or more. "Meal in a peel," a baked potato with meat, vegetables, and cheese on the top can be a very quick and nutritious meal from the microwave and certainly less expensive than the fast food restaurant. There is very little cleanup with microwave cooking because you can cook on the serving dish.

Leftovers can be made into your own TV dinners and popped into the microwave for a quick meal with more imagination and more nutrition than the purchased kind.

Stir frying is an easy way to cook quickly. Use a wok or a skillet to stir-fry chicken, beef, pork, other meats or seafood. The meat should be fully cooked, but all the vegetables are better if still crunchy. Lemon juice or herbs sprinkled on these will eliminate salt and bring out the good flavor of the vegetables.

Crock pots are great for long, slow cooking in the summer or winter. (They add only minimal heat to the kitchen). Let the crock pot cook all day and when you arrive home the soup/stew is ready. Serve bread and a piece of fruit and you have a nutritious meal in minutes! Since a crock pot makes a larger batch, freeze some for another time. Tough meats cooked in liquid with a slow cooking method can make them very tender.

Food processors and blenders make chopping, peeling, slicing, shredding and pureeing easier and quicker. Do extra for the next time so you are preparing two or more meals at one time. One mess, one cleanup.

Broiling and stove top cooking are usually faster than one-item oven cooking. Do several things at the same time. If the oven is set on 400, in 30 minutes you can have meat pie, biscuit roll-ups, pasties, baked salmon, scalloped potatoes, cobbler, baked apples, and muffins. If the oven is set on 375, in one hour you can have meat loaf, casseroles, spanish rice, stuffed peppers, baked potatoes, upside-down cake, and gingerbread.

If the oven is on, make two roasts at the same time. Use one and freeze the other. Remember when you double a recipe you only clean the kitchen once! A freezer can really be helpful for a quick meal by offering convenience and flexibility to meal planning. Freeze foods in containers you can use in the microwave or oven. You do not have to wait to thaw them out — just pop in the oven.

You still may be tempted to turn into the first fast food place you pass on the way home, so make nutritious choices. Whether it be fast foods or making foods fast, remember the key is moderation and variety for good eating and good health.

It's all Greek to me

Take the mystery out of hors d'oeuvres

In Greece, where the sea is never far and sunshine is abundant, a time-honored tradition is good conversation savored with a sip of ouzo and a variety of mezes.

Eaten throughout the day, mezes are Greek appetizers (hot and cold) and unique dips, finger food and small pies. With a seemingly endless variety from which to choose, mezes are perfect starters to a meal or unique alternatives to usual party fare.

"Think of it as the Greek equivalent of a Spanish tapas bar," says Charles Bowman, chef of New York's Peryali restaurant.

Bowman, along with Eric Moschallidis, president of the Greek Food and Wine Institute, was on hand at the recent Aspen Food and Wine Classic to tout a cuisine that is low in saturated fat and cholesterol, yet remarkably flavorful.

Forget heavy sauces. Greek dishes are natural, simple and quick with an emphasis on healthy ingredients like fresh fruits and vegetables, seafoods, grains, olives, olive oils and cheese.

Five to seven items usually fill the typical meze table. Marinated olives, spreads (called salads), stuffed grape leaves and spinach and cheese pies are popular. Says Bowman, "You can even create enough dishes that the meze can be a meal unto itself."

No meze table is complete without Greek olives, feta cheese, crusty breads and olive oil. Among the varieties of Greek olives, Kalamata and Greek Black are the two most popular.

According to Moschallidis, consumers should look for olives that are firm in texture.

"The almond-shaped Kalamata is purplish in color and probably the tastiest," he says. "Greek black olives are actually brownish-gray or greenish color, meaty, mild and semisoft. Cured in olive oil."

Though Greek olives are ready to eat from the jar, you can marinate them for extra flavor. Look for them in specialty stores and larger supermarket delis.

Feta cheese is also synonymous with Greek food. In fact, Greece is per capita the top consumer of cheese and feta may be the reason. The white semisoft product is consumed for breakfast, lunch and dinner.

"Today feta is made from several different kinds of milk, but the best is sheep's milk, aged in oak kegs for at least 90 days," agree Bowman and Moschallidis.

The better fetas are firm, packed in brine and not too salty. If your feta comes wrapped simply in plastic wrap, make your own brine (fill a container three-quarters full with water, milk and a little salt).

Refrigerated and stored in brine, feta will remain fresh for up to six months. Bowman recommends a square of feta with olive oil and fresh oregano as a tasty treat.

If you decide to set a meze table remember to choose a variety of dishes, balancing tastes and textures. And don't be intimidated by the number of mezes needed. Most can be prepared partially or completely in advance, making them ideal for even the busiest cook.

The following recipes are from *The Peryali Cookbook* by Holly Garrison (Willard Books).

MARINATED OLIVES

1 pound large black or green Greek olives or a mixture of both
1 large garlic clove, thinly sliced
¼ cup extra-virgin olive oil
1 tablespoon lemon juice
¼ teaspoon dried oregano leaves, crumbled
¼ teaspoon dried thyme leaves, crumbled
Sprigs of fresh oregano or thyme for garnish

Yields 1 pound marinated olives
Blot olives dry on paper towels. Toss in medium-size bowl with garlic. In small bowl, beat olive oil, lemon juice, oregano and thyme. Stir into garlic and olives until well blended.

Transfer to container with tight-fitting lid. Cover and set aside at room temperature for several days, or up to several weeks, turning container occasionally to redistribute olives and marinade. There's no need to refrigerate olives since oil will keep them fresh.

Serve olives in bowl with a few fresh sprigs of oregano or thyme tucked here and there. As olives are removed from marinade, more olives can be added. This may be done several times, adding a little more olive oil, as necessary, before starting over with new marinade.

TARAMOSALATA (Fish Roe Dip)

8 ounces (about 8 slices) firm homemade-style white bread
1 tablespoon chopped red onion



The cuisine of Greece combines a variety of fresh fruits and vegetables and is among the healthiest in the world.

1 small garlic clove, chopped
¼ cup tarama (mullet or cod roe sold in jars in the refrigerated section of Greek grocery stores)
2 tablespoons lemon juice
1 tablespoon white-wine vinegar
¼ cup extra-virgin olive oil
¼ cup vegetable oil
¼ teaspoon sugar
Salmon or golden whitefish caviar or a few Kalamata olives, for garnish

Yields 6 to 8 appetizer servings.
Trim crusts from bread and spread slices out on tray to dry for about 24 hours.

Into food processor place onion, garlic, tarama, lemon juice and vinegar. Blend or process until as smooth as possible, scraping down side of container several times.

With processor running, gradually add a mixture of both oils through feed tube. The oil must be added slowly so that it forms an emulsion.

Fill large bowl with cool water.
Drop dried bread into the water, one slice at a time. When it is soaked, squeeze out as much water as possible and drop into processor feed tube. When all bread has been added, add sugar and process until smooth. Taste and add a little more vinegar and lemon juice, if necessary.

The finished consistency should be something like softly whipped cream, just firm enough to mold slightly when dropped from spoon. Keep in mind that dip will

thicken as it chills, so if it seems heavy at this point, gradually beat in a little water. Scrape into serving bowl. Cover tightly and chill for several hours before serving. Garnish servings with a few grains of caviar or an olive

SOUVLAKI (Skewered Meat)

1 (¼ cup) small onion, minced
¼ cup lemon juice or dry white wine
2 tablespoons regular (not extra-virgin) olive oil
¼ teaspoon dried oregano leaves, crumbled
1 pound lean, boneless lamb or beef, cut into ½- to ¾-inch cubes
Salt and freshly ground black pepper to taste

Yields 8 appetizer servings.
In medium-size bowl, mix onion, lemon juice, olive oil and oregano. Add meat and stir until well coated.

Cover and refrigerate for several hours or overnight, stirring occasionally.

Prepare a bed of hot charcoal. Thread meat tightly onto six 6-inch skewers, dividing evenly. If oven broiling, cook about 6 inches below the source of heat for 3 to 5 minutes or until close to medium hot coals, turning frequently for 3 to 4 minutes.

The aim is meat that's well browned on the outside, but still pink and juicy in the center. Season with salt and pepper and serve immediately

Lively auctions move fish along in a hurry

This column is the sixth in a series examining the fish preparation of Foley's, a Boston fish wholesaler.

It is early as we head for New Bedford, on this, our last day of fish school.

Today we will observe a fish auction. Auctions are the means by which millions of pounds of fish are priced for sale by fishermen to seafood dealers. The New Bedford auction is linked by telephone to

the Boston Fish Auction, to the Fulton Fish Market in New York City and to other major regional markets such as Baltimore and Philadelphia.

A stand of phones is always busy with the sellers talking to buyers. Their conversations represent the interplay of supply and demand which are the foremost factors affecting prices set at the auction. These fish prices determine the income for thousands of fishermen, fish markets, the supermarkets and set the basis for menu pricing in thousands of restaurants serving Atlantic seafood.

The auction is held in a small, drab, smoke-filled room. Not many people are present. One whole wall is filled by a chalk board listed with boats and their catches. Each fish species is registered by pound.

The buyers bidding on the boats have done their homework. They know the captains, where they have been fishing, their work standards, and how long they have been out to sea. Today there are only three boats and minimal poundage of fish. Many of the fishermen are Portuguese and admired for their fishing capabilities.

Today they are griping and complaining about the small amount of fish they have come home with. Fishing is not what it used to be. No more dropping in nets and pulling out fish. It has become an art and very scientific because of the abuse overfishing has caused in recent years.

The first auction is exclusively scallops. It starts at 7 a.m. and ends at 7:15 a.m. Monday through Friday. At 8 the second auction, the dragger auction, begins with

the sounding of the bell and hollering of fish price bids by dealer representatives to union reps who record the bids alongside the relevant boat's haul.

Buyers have the right to raise the price by as little as one tenth of a cent per pound. At 8:15 and 8:17, bells ring denoting times the fishermen can reject bids and withdraw their boat from market bidding. At 8:22 the final bell sounds and whomever is on the board as the last bidder owns the entire boatload of fish.

The age and species differ. Since Foley's won't procure any fish older than two or three days, their buyer does not bid at the auction but pays a premium to dealers in exchange for the right to inspect fish before purchasing.

And that was our next stop, the fish

house that purchased the boat's load. We entered a dilapidated waterfront warehouse, where a flurry of action had begun for the unloading and packaging of the fish they had just purchased.

Crate upon crate was labeled and ready for their trip to the big city markets. Also coming out were bins of handpicked, top-of-the-catch fish on their way to the Foley's New Bedford plant and on to customers nationwide.

Next week's article ends the seminar and begins a short Provincetown vacation. One more time, Marty.

Greek mezes please palates

BROILED HALOUMI CHEESE

3 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil
1 pound Haloumi or salted mozzarella cheese
2 tablespoons lemon juice
3 teaspoons minced fresh mint leaves

Yields 6 servings.

Preheat oven broiler. Rub 6 gratin dishes with about 1 tablespoon of olive oil and set aside. Cut cheese into 6 equal slices. Place in prepared dishes. Fill each cheese-filled dish with cold water, then, holding cheese in dish, pour off water. Place dishes on oven rack about 6 inches below source of heat. Broil for about 5 minutes, watching carefully, until golden brown and bubbly. Remove from

broiler and sprinkle each serving with 1 teaspoon olive oil, 1 teaspoon lemon juice and ½ teaspoon mint. Serve immediately, accompanied by crusty bread.

BLACK-EYED PEA SALAD

1 (15-ounce) can black-eyed peas or 2 cups cooked black-eyed peas
1 (¼ cup) small red onion, finely chopped
2 tablespoons chopped flat-leaf parsley
¼ teaspoon salt
Pinch of white pepper
2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil
1 tablespoon red or white wine vinegar
Chopped flatleaf parsley, for garnish

Yields 4 servings.

Drain peas in colander and rinse

with cool water; drain thoroughly. (If using dried peas, prepare as package directs.) Turn into medium-size bowl and toss gently with onion, parsley, salt and pepper. Add olive oil and vinegar and toss again until well-blended. Set aside at room temperature for a couple of hours to allow flavors to permeate peas. Serve sprinkled with parsley.

The following recipe is from "The Food and Wine of Greece" by Diane Kochilas (St. Martin's Press).

HTIPTI (pronounced h-tee-pee-TEE and translated as "that which is beaten") is the name Macedonians gave to this tart feta spread. The longer it is beaten, the tender it will be.

HTIPTI

½ pound feta
3 tablespoons olive oil

1 medium Italian pepper, seeded and finely chopped
2 small, dried red chili peppers, finely chopped
1 pickled green pepper, seeded and chopped
2 teaspoons oregano
Freshly grated pepper
Fresh juice of ½ lemon, strained
Black olive, for garnish
Yields about 1 cup.

In medium-size bowl, mash feta with fork or potato masher and slowly add olive oil, chopped peppers, oregano and black pepper. Pulverize mixture for about 10 minutes (less if using food processor), pouring in lemon juice a little at a time, until feta is creamy. Cover and refrigerate at least 1 hour before serving.

Some nutrition questions answered

Here are some answers to common nutrition questions from Karen Collins, a registered dietitian for the American Institute for Cancer Research.

It's barbecue season, and hot dogs are a tradition. How unhealthy are they really?

The nutrient content of hot dogs varies considerably. Traditional types are quite high in fat, with about 12-16 grams of fat each.

Turkey hot dogs are often down to about 8 grams of fat. But even this is actually relatively high-fat for only an ounce-and-a-half of meat.

Some truly lean hot dogs are now available with only 2 grams of fat per hot dog. However, sodium content is generally still 500-600 mg each (a large proportion of the recommended maximum of 2000-3300 mg daily). And even low-fat hot dogs usually contain nitrite as a preservative. Nitrite reacts with components of protein to form nitrosamines, a known carcinogen.

If vitamin C is added to the meat or if the meal includes a vitamin C-rich fruit or vegetable, carcinogen formation can be inhibited. If you rarely eat hot dogs, the negatives of their nutritional content is not really significant for you. But if you eat them frequently, it would probably be wise to choose the

low-fat types, limit the number you eat, and fill up on salad, vegetables, fruit, and grain products.

I enjoy using yogurt instead of sour cream in dips, but when I cook with it, the yogurt sometimes separates or curdles. What am I doing wrong?

To keep yogurt from separating in foods that are to be cooked or stirred vigorously, mix a tablespoon of cornstarch with a tablespoon of the yogurt first; then add this mixture to the rest of the yogurt before adding it to the dish. When cooking with yogurt, add it at the end of cooking just to heat through; never let it boil.

Exercise more, eat less to limit gain

The average American gains about 30 pounds between the ages of 25 and 55. Weight gain during these years typically creeps on at about one or two pounds a year. One day we look at the scale and say — "Where did all this come from?"

Research suggests less exercise is a major reason for "creeping weight," said Karen Collins, a registered dietitian for the American Institute of Cancer Research.

Even if we eat the same amount as always, if we burn off fewer calories, the extra will be stored as fat. In addition, as we are less active, we lose metabolically active muscle tissue, and therefore burn up even fewer calories each day.

Some researchers believe that a

modest weight gain as we age is normal and not associated with any increased health risks. But it does make sense to look at your lifestyle to make sure that any weight gain is likely to remain small.

People experiencing middle-age weight gain often say, "But I eat the same way that I always have!" That's part of the problem. Our metabolic rate, the rate at which we burn up calories, slows down 2 to 3 percent each decade over age 30.

Combining a lower activity level and a lower metabolic rate means that we need fewer calories as we get older. So eating the same as you did 10 years ago would be expected to cause weight gain.

Break the habit of automatically taking the same portion you've always taken, and then eating it all just because it's there. Instead, focus on your physical hunger signals; if your stomach tells you to stop eating, that's the time to stop, regardless of how good something tastes or how much you've "always" eaten.

Another important strategy is creating low-fat eating habits. Many studies in recent years have found that high-fat diets increase the body's tendency to store fat. And not only do low-fat diets tend to keep your body leaner, they may also keep it healthier. Low-fat diets have been linked with lower risk of both heart disease and cancer, according to the

American Institute for Cancer Research.

Overall, then, you don't need to panic over small weight gains as you age. But check your lifestyle to make sure that little gains that creep up don't add up to big ones. Find time to keep physically active, not just busy. And work to create eating habits centered on a low-fat diet eaten in amounts directed by physical hunger, not habits created years ago.

Even Irish oughta shun green taters

Potato salad is one food summer wouldn't be the same without.

While potatoes have a reputation as being off-limits to dieters, a medium potato has only about 100 calories, same as a medium apple. It's what you put on the potato that's the problem. Deli potato salad can be quite high in fat content.

If you're watching your calories this summer but still want to enjoy the full flavor of potato salad, make your own. Instead of regular high-fat mayonnaise, substitute reduced-calorie mayonnaise or plain non-fat yogurt. Season with vinegar, mustard and herbs and add chopped fresh vegetables.

Different varieties of potatoes vary in density, and this can affect microwave cooking time. Always check after the first time given in your recipe to avoid overcooking.

Different densities also makes for different textures. Russets are more grainy and can sometimes turn mushy in a potato salad, while small new potatoes, with their smoother, firmer texture, hold up well.

Peel spuds or leave the skin on, as you prefer.

Store potatoes in a cool, dry place. This is especially important during hot summer months. Check for green spots and remove them before cooking. (The green is chlorophyll, which appears on the potato's surface if it's been exposed to too much heat and light.) Removing green spots will remove solanine, a substance that can cause digestive disorders in some people (it tastes bitter too).

Keep potatoes cool during summer — but not too cool. Refrigerate spuds and some of the starch will convert into sugar, giving them a sweet taste you may not want. The increased sugar may also cause potatoes to darken as they cook. Store potatoes at about 45 F. for best results.

Keep your own cool by staying away from oven and stove-top recipes when you can. These appliances create heat in your home, and you can do without any increase in the temperature during midsummer. Your cool-cooking microwave can help you turn out tasty foods, like today's trio of potato salads, without turning up the heat.

MICROWAVED BOILED POTATOES

To boil potatoes in your microwave, cut into uniform size chunks and place in even layer in glass baking dish. Add water to barely cover and microwave at high (100 percent power) for 8 to 10 minutes for 2 potatoes; 16 to 18 minutes for 4 potatoes. If you'll be needing more than 6 medium-sized boiled potatoes, it will probably be faster to boil them on the stove top.

NEW POTATO SALAD

1 1/2 pounds small new potatoes
1/2 cup water
2 tablespoons olive oil
2 tablespoons red wine vinegar
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper
1/2 cup chopped celery
3 tablespoons minced red onion
2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley
1/2 cup mayonnaise cream
1/2 cup plain yogurt or sour cream
1 teaspoon prepared mustard

Yields 4 to 6 servings.
Preparation time: 15 minutes (plus chilling time).

Cooking time: 9 to 12 minutes (plus 5 minutes standing time).
Oven setting: high (100 percent).
Scrub potatoes and cut into eighths. Place in 3-quart microwave safe casserole and add water. Cover and microwave 9 to 12 minutes or until potatoes are almost tender, stirring gently twice during cooking

time. Drain well. Let stand, covered, 5 minutes.
Add olive oil, vinegar, salt and pepper; toss. Cover and refrigerate at least 30 minutes to chill.

Toss in celery, onion and parsley. In small bowl combine mayonnaise, yogurt or sour cream and mustard. Add to potatoes and toss gently to coat. Serve immediately or cover and chill until serving time.

SUMMER POTATO-EGG SALAD

5 to 6 medium potatoes (2 to 2 1/2 pounds), peeled and cut into 1-inch cubes
1/2 cup water
2 large eggs
1/2 cup diced celery
1/2 cup chopped green onion (include white parts)
1/2 cup sliced black olives
2 tablespoons sweet pickle relish
1 cup mayonnaise
2 tablespoons vinegar
1 teaspoon dry mustard
Salt and pepper to taste

Yields: 6 to 8 servings.
Preparation time: 15 minutes (plus optional chilling time).

Cooking time: 14 to 18 minutes.
Oven setting: high (100 percent power); medium (50 percent power).

Combine potatoes and water in a 3-quart microwave-safe casserole. Cover and microwave at high setting 12 to 15 minutes or until tender, stirring once halfway through cooking time. Rinse under cold tap water, drain well and set aside to cool.

Break eggs into two glass custard cups. Pierce each yolk with toothpick. Cover with wax paper and microwave 2 to 3 minutes at medium setting, rotating each cup every minute, until eggs are almost set.

Let stand a minute or so to cool, then chop well.

In large salad bowl toss together cubed potatoes, chopped eggs, celery, green onion, black olives and pickle relish.

In a small mixing bowl combine mayonnaise, vinegar and dry mustard; stir well to blend. Add to potato mixture and toss gently to coat. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Serve immediately or chill until serving time.

GERMAN POTATO SALAD

6 slices bacon, chopped
1/2 cup chopped green onion
1/2 medium bell pepper, chopped
1/2 cup white wine vinegar
2 tablespoons granulated sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt
5 to 6 medium potatoes (about 2 1/2 pounds)
1/2 cup water
1 tablespoon chopped fresh parsley

Yields 4 to 6 servings.
Preparation time: 15 minutes.
Cooking time: 16 to 21 minutes.
Oven setting: high (100 percent power).

Combine bacon, green onion and bell pepper in 1-quart microwave-safe casserole. Cover and microwave 4 to 6 minutes, or until bacon is done. Add vinegar, sugar and salt; stir and set aside.

Peel potatoes and slice 1/4 inch thick. Arrange potato slices in 2-quart microwave-safe casserole, add water and cover. Microwave 12 to 15 minutes, or until potatoes are tender, stirring gently halfway through cooking time. Drain well. Add bacon mixture, toss and cover. Let stand 5 minutes before serving. Garnish with chopped fresh parsley.

Some food freezes to a gloppy mess

If you're a gardener, soon you'll be bringing neighbors, relatives, and co-workers gifts of wine-ripened, juicy tomatoes, and bunches of basil and parsley.

And don't forget fruit — raspberries, peaches and plums. You can't possibly eat them all, and most of us don't have time to can. So what's a weekend gardener to do?

Why not make some freezer jellies and jams to enjoy in the winter when you can't get fresh produce, or give as gifts?

Even if you're not a gardener, but someone who swears you can't beat the taste of home-grown fruits and vegetables, freezer jam is the perfect way to savor those tasty memories all winter long. Produce markets and roadside stands are brimming with freshly picked fruits and vegetables. Now is the time to jam.

When you think of jams and jellies, don't just consider the familiar fruit versions.

Herb jelly flavored with fresh basil, minced fresh parsley and grated lemon peel is the perfect accompaniment to meat and poultry. Use it as a glaze for pork roast or spread it on crackers and top with thinly sliced meat or mild cheese or an appetizer.

Salsa jam, made with ripe plum-tomatoes, onions, cilantro, hot peppers

and lime, adds zest to fajitas or quesadillas.

Freezer jams and jellies are easy enough for beginners to make. The ingredients are simple — crushed fruit or vegetables, sugar, water, and powdered pectin, a natural substance found in fruit that boosts the jelling process in jam-making.

"Freezer jam doesn't take all day to make," said Sandy Garcia of Farmington Hills. "It has a homemade flavor. I don't notice a difference in flavor and texture from cooked jams."

Like cooked jams, making freezer jam is a science. "The biggest mistake people make is they don't follow the directions," said Garcia.

"They don't boil it long enough so it doesn't thicken. They try to double the recipe, and you can't. You can't use sugar substitutes either. Use regular granulated sugar. Use glass or plastic containers with a good seal and sterilize jars in the dishwasher."

Lisa Van Riper, a spokeswoman for the Sure-Jell brand of fruit pectin, agrees. "Making jams and jellies is an exact science," she said. "Stick to the recipe and you won't have any problems. Don't substitute ingredients. Use the type of pectin the recipe calls for. Each brand of fruit pectin has a different formulation."

It's also important to use fully ripened fruits and vegetables that are thoroughly rinsed with clear water. Crush berries one cup at a time. A potato masher works best, said Van Riper. If you use a food processor, pulse to chop the fruit. Do not puree. The jam should contain pieces of fruit.

You can substitute unsweetened frozen fruit for fresh fruit. Thaw the fruit to room temperature before crushing to equal the same amount of crushed fresh fruit. Do not drain off excess juice.

Keep in mind that a full rolling boil is a boil that does not stop when stirred. It is essential to get a full rolling boil for jam or jelly to set. Boil for the amount of time specified.

Brokaw, Couric take anchor seats of NBC's 'Now'

Last April, NBC announced the development of its new prime-time news magazine, "NBC Prime Story," with co-anchors Fred Francis, Faith Daniels and Mike Schneider and executive producer Steve Friedman. In the interim months, the peacock network decided brighter plumage was needed for its news magazine, so the brass refitted the program with a more happening name and called upon the news division's credible king and perky queen. "Now With Tom Brokaw and Katie Couric" premieres Wednesday, Aug. 18.

National-security reporter Francis has been retained as one of the program's six correspondents; Mike Boettcher, Noah Nelson, Chris Hansen, Dana Adams and Elizabeth Vargas round out the staff. The post of executive producer has been refilled as well, with Friedman swapping jobs with the much younger Jeff Zucker, head honcho of "The Today Show." Speaking for "Now," Zucker acknowledges the drawing power of Brokaw and Couric.

"I think the fact that Tom's doing (NBC's "Nightly News") and Katie is on 'The Today Show' will benefit

all of us," Zucker says. "Certainly Tom's ability to reach an audience every night will help draw people to this program. Katie's got the same thing on 'The Today Show.'" But Zucker adds that each would bring "incredible credibility" to "Now" without their affiliation to the other shows.

Brokaw, who will keep his anchor seat on "Nightly News" and continue with an occasional edition of "Tom Brokaw Reports," views the news magazine's reassignments with the candid realism of a veteran reporter.

"The fact is that if you're looking at launching a new program," Brokaw says, "you want to put the strongest people that you have in front of that program."

Brokaw says the format of "Now," which includes both live and filmed reports, promises to distinguish the program from other news magazines.

"I do think that we can bring to the format now something that is a little more responsive than the magazine programs that are out there at the same time," Brokaw says. "One of the things that I think has happened, not just in our

business but in the print medium as well, is that we're all kind of circling the same issues and the same topics. We'd like to be able to establish a pattern where we can bring things to the attention of people in the rest of the country that may be happening regionally."

Since his career breakthrough covering the Watergate scandal, Brokaw has seen first-hand much of the evolution of television news coverage, and he has his own ideas about its future.

"My great dream," says Brokaw, "is that some day we'll have a one-hour nightly newscast. That would be, I think, a cherished hope of everybody in all the news divisions in all the networks. That, at some point, you could have a nightly program, 10:00 to 11:00 (Eastern), 9:00 to 10:00, whatever, that would be a combination of that day's news and other feature reporting. But that is an evolutionary process."

"What is heartening about what's been going on this summer is that people are watching news-magazine programs. And if the success of these news magazines moves us in that direction, all the better."
