Twp. chiefs look at plan to consolidate

If it isn't broken, then don't fix it. That's the stance Northville Fire Chief Rick Roselle and Police Chief Chip Snider are taking on the proposed merging of the township's police and fire departments.

The two chiefs sat side by side Thursday night before the township board of trustees and reacted to the consolidation proposal that surfaced two weeks ago from township administrators.

Snider was the first to put in his two cents on the proposal that aims to merge the police and fire departments into a public safety department under his direction.

"If it ain't squeaking, don't oil it. It is working," he told trustees at the meeting where officials intended to discuss the issue.

The proposed plan, if adopted, would merge the two departments under Snider's command. Roselle

would remain in charge of the fire department, but his administrative duties would be turned over to Assistant Fire Chief Bill Zhemendak. The public safety department would then share a clerical person, but the police and fire department budgets would remain independent of one another.

The police chief said he could see some administrative merit in merging the departments under a nominal consolidation, but said he would be opposed to fully integrating the departments and cross-training both forces.

Snider said since the departments are working cooperatively now as independent agencies he saw little merit to the proposal that was written by Township Manager Bill Richards and Township Supervisor Karen Baja.

The chief, who was a public safety director in Farmington years ago, said he could see clerical advantages

Trustees create list of priorities

When Northville Township Trustees were sworn in last November they sat down and drafted a list of goals and priorities.

Nine months later, few of those goals have been met and most have been abandoned or forgotten, according to Township Clerk Sue Hillebrand.

The clerk said many of the trustees' initial priorities have been met, but they were small, mental issues that took little time to resolve. It's the big issues like the dirt roads and the county land development that have lingered over time and are stalling the board now.

Even though the clerk said Thursday night board members have made progress during the infant stages of their four-year terms, their focus has diverted from their original goals and priorities because they have been

plagued with crisis management since taking office last fall.

Hillebrand said even though trustees are gaining headway in meeting some of their larger goals, progress has been slow coming because trustees have lost their focus.

She wanted to change that and get the trustees back on track.

At Thursday night's study session, she organized an exercise designed to help trustees set priorities. She asked each board member to individually jot down 15 of the top priorities they'd like to accomplish in the next nine months. Hillebrand compiled the list and then had trustees narrow down the list by shortlisting their 15 to their top five.

Included on the top priority list are:

- Shared services
- Financial planning
- Developing a mission statement

Activists offer school financing tips

If one thing is certain in a time of educational financing unrest, it's that the state Legislature will oblige in providing lively discussions for local groups such as Advocates for Quality Education, the PTA, and Legislative Action Network (LAN).

Lynda Baca, president of Advocates and past chairperson of LAN, is only too ready to scrutinize whatever proposals the state hands out.

"We're very concerned with what the Legislature is going to do," she said. "Very concerned."

Baca was referring to Senate Bill 1, which does away with the concept of property taxes as the method of financing school operations. Now the

only thing lawmakers have to do is figure out where it plans to make up the \$6.5 billion loss to schools.

And they don't have long. The bill will affect the 1994-95 school year.

In the meantime, Baca is hoping to initiate more people into Advocates as the group holds a membership drive this fall.

"The more members we have, the more impact we'll have," Baca said.

Advocates will hold its first meeting of the 1993-94 school year at 7:30 p.m. Sept. 29 at Northville High School. The agenda includes a look at the by-laws as well as the issues confronting the group this year.

"If you've never gotten involved in the schools, this is the year to do it because the Legislature is going to re-define what public education is,"

Baca said. "We would rather have mainstream parents helping in deciding this instead of large professional organizations."

During the Advocates membership drive, forms will be sent to approximately 5,000 to 8,000 homes in the Northville school district area. Dues are \$10 for members and \$2 for high school students.

Some Advocates activities in the past include taking positions on Proposals A and C in last November's election; the Downtown Development Authority's Mainstreet '92 plan; a tax abatement proposal in the township for Optical Imaging System; the Northville school budget; collective bargaining in the school district; the school millage and voter analysis.

Most recently, Advocates sent letters to Northville Board of Education members with a list of suggestions to improve the image of the school district.

Baca said the suggestions were not meant to be critical, but rather were ideas gleaned from members of Advocates as well as the community.

The suggestions were as follows:

- "Develop a public relations plan, possibly using a community committee including local public relations expertise that may assist the administration at relatively little cost."
- "More information on school budgets, cost-saving measures, administrative costs and responsibilities, state mandates and costs."

New hire will keep city's books

Northville City Hall has a new chief bookkeeper.

Nicolette Bateson, 29, has been hired to head the city's accounting department.

Bateson started at Northville Monday, Aug. 9.

The Novi resident was one of more than 130 applicants for the position, vacated June 4 when former chief accountant/systems manager Beverly Walters left to become Farmington's new assistant clerk/treasurer.

Walters had served five years as the city's finance director until many of that position's responsibilities together with assessing tasks were combined under the newly-created title of chief financial officer in early 1992, and the title was given to former assessor Mark Christiansen.

Walters was reassigned then to the new position of chief accountant/systems manager.

Bateson, a certified public accountant, will hold those titles as well as serve as the city's treasurer. She will earn a starting salary of \$38,500.

Bateson has spent the past five years working with Grant Thornton in Southfield. The firm is the seventh largest accounting firm in the country, she said.

As an audit supervisor for Grant Thornton, Bateson's duties included performing audits on small and mid-size companies, reviewing internal control procedures and instructing entry-level accountants and client personnel. Her client firms included

non-profit agencies, governmental organizations and construction firms with annual revenues between \$2 million and \$90 million. Northville City's general fund revenues last year totaled \$3.7 million.

Bateson's assignments as a CPA often involved spending two to four weeks at a firm, recommending changes and then moving on. She looked toward municipal work as a way to stick around and see her ideas implemented.

"I missed out on being at one place

on a long-term basis," she said. "I'd like to be at one place on an ongoing basis where I can suggest changes and help put them in place."

Though she sees room for possible improvement in the city's purchasing and accounts payable practices and its computer systems, Bateson said she is pleased with the general attitude at city hall.

"I'm really impressed with the people here," she said. "Everyone's very positive and forward-thinking, and that's really half the battle."

City Manager Gary Word said he is still deciding what added responsibilities Bateson may take on as the city hall operating structure continues to evolve.

She may be assigned more administrative duties and be given the chance to institute internal policies for the city's accounting department, he said.

Bateson holds a bachelor's of business administration in professional accounting from the University of Michigan.

School officials prepare to make budget decisions

Northville Board of Education members are expected to take the conservative approach and approve four budget priorities at tonight's meeting.

The athletic and co-curricular pay-to-participate program will not be among the priorities — at least not yet.

Tentatively scheduled for reinstatement include Charlie Sulec's full-time position as Student Assistance Coordinator, \$25,000; Jan Purcell's part-time business education partnerships program, \$10,500; two high school hall monitors, \$35,840; and two part-time resource teachers, \$41,000. One of the part-

time resource teachers would be placed in the science and math division while the other would concentrate on the K-6 language arts curriculum.

Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski said the board is basing the reinstatements on a \$900,000 general budget. That figure was calculated based on a 3 percent property tax cap.

"We could have as much as \$1.8 million but we'd be playing on soft money and that's not wise management," Rezmierski said.

In other words, the district is hesitant in counting on the higher figure because it doesn't know how much it will receive in state funding.

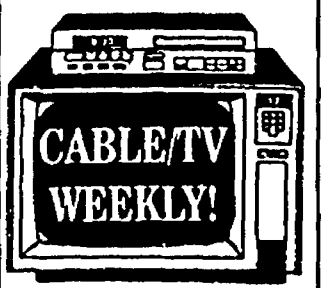

Student help, partnership programs to get nod

And it looks like it will be a while as the House and Senate will not meet until Sept. 15 to discuss the State School Aid Act.

"There is a sizeable swing (in provisions of the state aid act)," Rezmierski said. "The difference is losing \$1,100,000 with the Senate's version to getting \$470,000 with the House version. It's all pure speculation now."

The Legislature's delay in approving the state aid is throwing another curve in Northville's game plan. Rezmierski said the board had hoped to know how the State School Aid Act

would have affected the district by its Sept. 13 meeting, allowing board members to make a final decision on pay-to-play.

If the district does receive the anticipated \$900,000 in revenues, then pay-to-play will more than likely be eliminated. The breakdown goes like this:

- The district would spend \$112,340 bringing back priorities expected to be approved at tonight's meeting (student assistance, business education partnerships, resource teachers and high school hall monitors).

An analysis of comments at a public hearing, 16 phone calls and

over 200 pieces of communication revealed that citizens believed student assistance should be the board's number one priority, followed by the elimination of pay-to-play.

- It would spend another \$236,511 to end the athletic and co-curricular pay-to-participate program.

- Another \$105,000 would be used to bring back three employees in the operations department. This would not be decided upon until after provisions of the state aid act are known.

- The offices of instruction and administrative services would split \$246,150 to reinstate programs in their respective departments upon approval.

● The remaining \$200,000 would be placed in fund equity.

"We need to still maintain what I believe is our biggest concern," Rezmierski said, referring to the district's uncertain funding future with the approval of Senate Bill 1. That bill, signed by Gov. John Engler Thursday, will eliminate property taxes as the main source of revenue of schools by cutting tax bills by two-thirds beginning July 1994. It has not yet been decided how lawmakers will replace the \$6.5 billion property taxes generate.

In addition to the funding riddle, Rezmierski is questioning how Lansing's latest move to redefine public

education will affect the morale of his work force.

"There will be so much speculation in the . . . media," he said. "We need to maintain a steadfast approach to what we consider is quality education."

He compared the current buzz in the educational world as someone putting together a parade that wasn't well organized.

"Sure, it's a bit of a risk," Rezmierski said of the board's pending

decision to approve positions tonight. "But it's too important for us to wait on some of these issues."

The district is looking into grants to fund both Stille's and Purcell's programs, the superintendent added.

"For what services they provide is \$112,000 of very defendable funds for services for kids," Rezmierski said. "Talk about bang for the dollar. This is money well spent even though we are going out a bit on a limb."

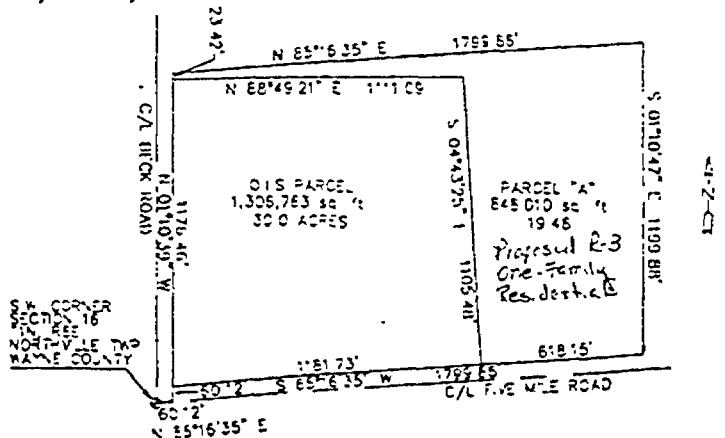

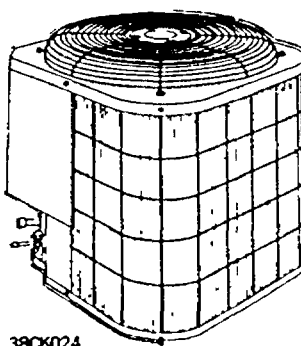

Grad continues athletic prowess

Where Are They Now?

As a senior at Northville High School in 1989, Karen Baird was elected "Most Athletic" in her class mock elections. Four years later, after a stellar career as an Adrian College athlete, her awards are just getting more frequent and more prestigious.

Baird was selected as the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association's MVP as a shortstop for the Bulldogs' softball team this year, is a two-time All-MIAA selection for golf, and received an honorable mention, All-MIAA, for basketball.

The icing on the cake came in May when Baird found out she was one of 12 softball players in the nation to be named All-American for Division III. Her selection to the team marked the first time an Adrian softball player has achieved the honor.

"It was overwhelming," Baird says of her election to the national squad, an honor which she hopes will open some doors for her in softball.

Her eligibility to play softball in college is up, but she says she has always dreamed of playing for the Olympic team. Tryouts for the Atlanta Olympics in '96 are by invitation only, and Baird says receiving All American recognition should help her chances of being invited to try out.

In the meantime, Baird will not be far from the playing field. Although her eligibility for both basketball and softball are up at Adrian, where she will finish her degree in health/physical education with a business minor this year, she will continue to play on the golf team and hopes to help coach both the basketball and softball teams this winter and spring.

"That's going to be the hardest transition... from playing to coaching," says Baird of the upcoming year.

But it's a transition she will eventually have to make anyway. Baird wants to pursue a career in college coaching—either in a Division III or Division II school—so this year's experience may very well be preparation for her future.

And balancing her new roles shouldn't be a problem for Baird, who is used to juggling overlapping practices, late-night bus trips home from away games, and a busy classload.

She is modest about her schedule, however, noting that managing three sports per year wasn't as big of a challenge as people might imagine.

"It really forces you to manage your time," she says, "I never got burned out."

The 22-year-old has managed to maintain a 3.1 grade point average

throughout her academic career. She's been active in Adrian's Peer Active Leader program, a peer education group made up of athletes, and as a volunteer in a YMCA youth camp

She says athletics have had a positive impact on her life in many ways. "It's opened up a lot of doors for me. It's made me become a well-rounded

person. I haven't always been on a winning team. I've learned just as much how to lose as how to win. You learn you can't always get what you want."

Mill Pond residents want action to help improve waterway

Mill Pond residents have banded together to seek solutions to clean up their waterway.

The city-owned pond, fed by the Middle Rouge River, has been filling with silt from years of upstream construction while fertilizers leaching into the water have stimulated algae growth.

Concerned residents met Thursday night at the Rouge Street home of Lacy Michaluk to brainstorm ways of saving their water view.

They dubbed themselves Friends of the Mill Pond and elected a board, with Horton resident Mike Anusbigian as their head.

Anusbigian sought city support for pond rehabilitation last November in an appearance before the city council. While the council promised no funds, the city's engineers were directed to analyze the rate at which the pond is filling with sediment. The aging dam at the south end of the pond is due for inspection this year.

Residents at Thursday's meeting reviewed various strategies for improving the pond's condition. Raising the water level was discussed but rejected because of the cost of modifying the downstream dam.

An idea that found more favor was making the pond more accessible to

the public with public access either at the Horton-Rayson curve or by Mill Race Historical Village and Ford Field.

Providing access by way of a pier or promenade could garner more public support for the Friends' efforts as well as make dredging and other cleanup efforts eligible for Department of Natural Resources funding, Michaluk said.

She said the group also plans to have T-shirts printed "not so much to raise money as to raise public awareness that there is a group trying to address the pond's problems."

Residents hope ultimately to dredge the fast-filling pond, but a \$200,000-plus price tag for dredging and a two- to three-year wait to obtain DNR approval has put those plans on hold. Aerating the pond to reduce algae growth has also been considered, at a price of \$14,000-\$20,000 for the start-up machinery alone.

The Friends of the Mill Pond will meet again at Michaluk's 536 Rouge Street home at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday, Sept. 1.

After that, group members will update the city council on their plans.

"The city owns the pond, so we have to work with the city," Michaluk said. "It's just a matter of time—and money."

Twp. police and fire chiefs comment on merger plan

for the police department in the proposal, but little else to warrant the merger.

He was also quick to squelch rumors that he lobbied for the merger, the promotion, and the additional \$6,500 salary increase that was part of the administration's original proposal. Even though the pay raise was deleted from the plan before it was pitched to trustees on Aug. 19, Snider is still battling the perception that he was rallying for the consolidation.

"This is a political decision. I didn't lobby for this. I didn't ask to be here, but I am," he said.

Under the plan, Rosselle would

have remained in charge of his department, but would be supervised by Snider. It's a plan that Snider and his officers may be comfortable with, but one that's not resting easy with Rosselle and his troops.

"I'll go along with most of the comments that Chief Snider has made, but it's not my idea and I'm not so sure it will work," Rosselle said. "... I really don't see where the problems are right now that we need to make a change like this, but it is really not what I think the police and fire departments want to do."

Several of the trustees asked the chiefs to outline the advantages and disadvantages of the proposed plan. Supervisor Karen Baja asked both if the plan would hinder either department's performance. Rosselle, who appeared to take offense at the proposal, responded curtly to Baja's query.

"I run the fire department. I'm in charge of the building and taking care of what needs to be done. No one has ever told me I'm doing it wrong," he said.

"And no one is now," Baja said. Baja rephrased her question and asked a visibly miffed Rosselle if the plan offered any positives for either of the departments.

"Yeah, there are some for the police department because they'll take the secretary from us..." the fire chief said. "But I really didn't see any positives that I can think of right now."

"It certainly isn't going to kill us, but my thought is if it isn't broken then don't fix it."

Snider said he took the proposal to the police officers and the commanders' unions to see how his staff would react to the proposal. He said they favored the plan as long as the departments were not fully consolidated.

"I took the proposal to the unions and their concerns were that they were not being faced with a full integration," Snider said. "You don't see them in the room, so that means they aren't concerned."

Rosselle told a different story and said the concept has his troops all fired up.

"When they first saw this thing they wanted to quit," Rosselle said. "I instructed them that they weren't going to do that. About 95 percent of my people are not in favor of this. They aren't violent about it, but they don't see enough positives to this."

The fire chief's opposition to the proposal convinced at least Township Clerk Sue Hillebrand to move to study the concept further before acting on it.

"I'm not opposed to it, but I would like to establish a committee to study it," she said. "I'd like to see a cost savings and a real financial benefit to the township before we move towards this."

The trustees, with the exception of Baja, backed Hillebrand's suggestion to defer the concept to committee for further study and recommendation. The supervisor tried to explain her motivations for pitching the idea and dispelling the notion that the proposal was critical of anyone's performance.

"I feel there is definite room for improvement," the supervisor said. "We tried to look at how that area could be improved. In my opinion, we looked at the strengths of the three individuals and tried to find a way to utilize their talents."

Baja praised both Rosselle and Snider for their performance on the job and said she never meant to "give the impression that we were critical of the current situation."

"I feel that Rickie Rosselle is an A-1 tactical person and if I had to walk into a burning building I wouldn't want to do it behind anyone else than Rickie Rosselle."

The supervisor said even though the plan wouldn't result in a huge cost savings for the township, there are cost cutting measures tucked inside it. She said bumping clerical/administrative aide Paula Sherman from the fire department to public safety would be more advantageous for both departments because, she said, Sherman is underutilized now.

Against Baja's wishes, the trustees agreed to appoint a three-person study committee to evaluate the proposal.

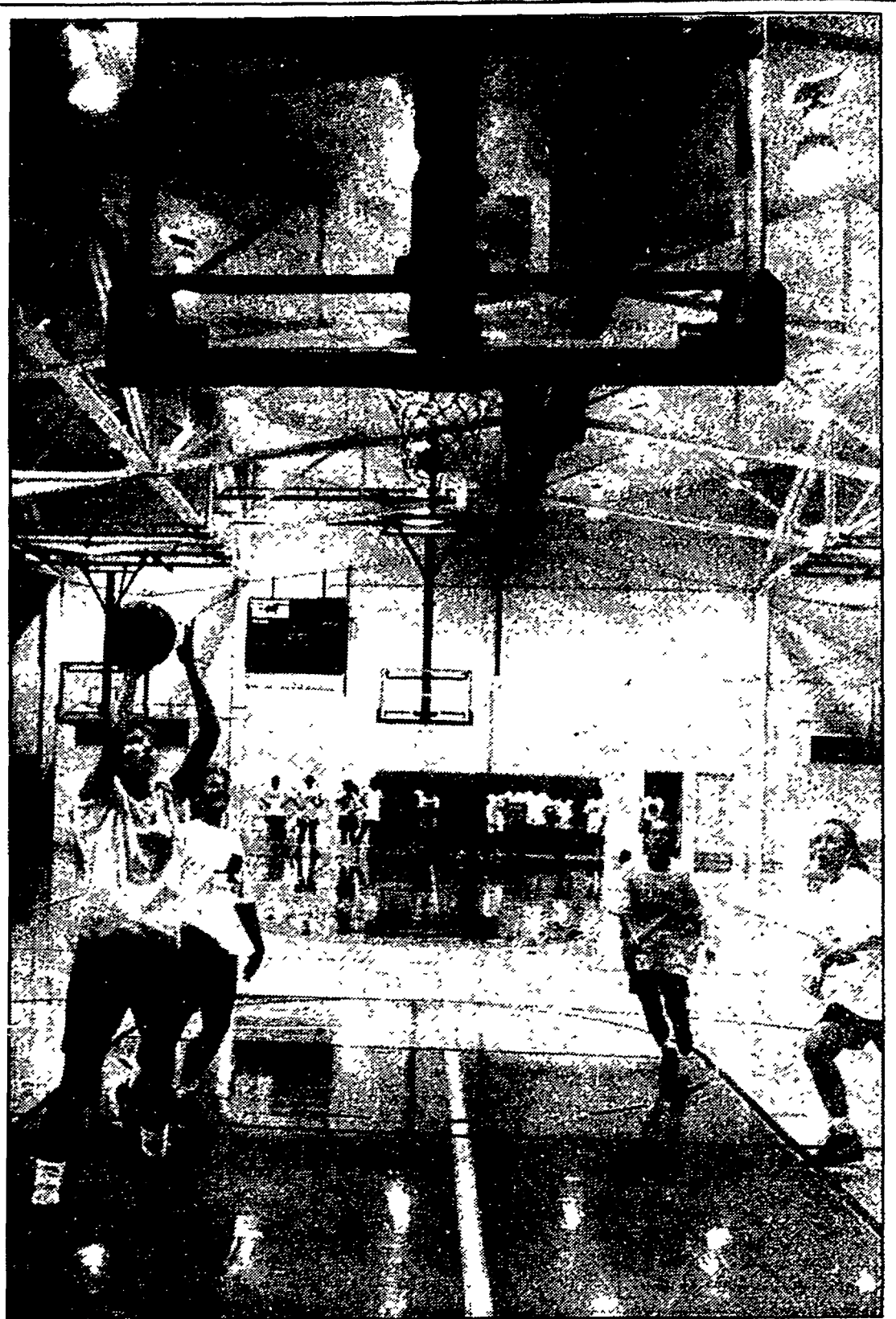

school finance, etc. could be included in *The School News*, monthly school newsletters and *The Northville Record*. Perhaps a regular column in those publications could feature the superintendent or a rotation of administrators/school board members explaining various aspects of school administration and finance.

● "Dates and agendas of board meetings, hearings and sub-committee meetings should be easily available via newspapers and telephone."

● "Consider community advisory groups to the board sub-committees to utilize local expertise and build a group of informed citizens on various school operation and education areas. Parents are already included on many committees such as school improvement, language arts and high school day. Volunteers should not be chosen, but all those inter-

ested should be encouraged to participate."

● "Administrator and board member attendance is appreciated at many school/community events. We would encourage the board to expand on and re-evaluate the traditional lines of communication with the community. What is the most effective means of creating a dialogue with the public? Expanding the telephone call-in, school board members might call five community members a month for feedback and fresh insights."

● "Presentations at school/community events on complex educational and finance topics should be planned in advance and be clear and concise, possibly using a few visual aids, charts, etc."

Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski said he and board member Joan Wadsworth have already met with a group of local citizens with expertise in public relations to help im-

prove the district's image.

"We're just trying to re-polish what we already do," Rezmierski said, adding that citizens have had input on the Thornton Creek Elementary boundary issue, the strategic plan, outcomes-based education and the K-6 language arts curriculum.

Groups such as LAN, Advocates, the PTA and Citizens for a Better Northville (CBN) serve a purpose only if they allow those wanting to express their opinions, Rezmierski said.

"If that is what meets the needs, fine," he said of the groups. "The bottom line is that is why we have an elected board of education. They're ultimately responsible for the operation of the district."

"You have to remember that 85 different committees can't rule the district. It's nice for everybody to have their say but we can't all have our way."

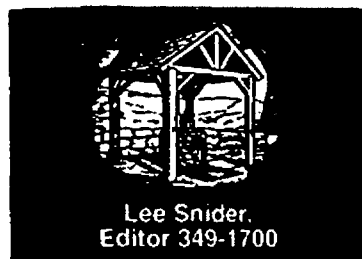

Manager needs chance to manage in township

New managers usually enjoy a brief grace period during which their subordinates act obligingly and make allowances for the lack of seniority of the new boss.

Often, what follows is a lengthy and difficult time of transition when workers test the resolve of the manager and decide to what extent they are going to be amenable to the manager's particular way of doing things.

In the case of Bill Richards, the grace period was over with in the blink of an eye and the transition is liable to be interminably long and well-nigh impossible to effect. Why? Because Richards is the manager of Northville Township, a place where government has a dubious history of disorder, distrust and insecurity.

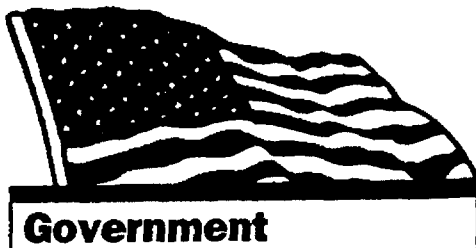
Richards is faced with the unenviable task of trying to reform Northville Township's administrative apparatus, and more than one official has seen fit to fight him tooth and nail.

Things started off well enough with acceptance of the manager's plan to institute a new chain-of-command procedure under which department heads report directly to the manager rather than the supervisor. The process of change remained on course when department heads agreed to dissolve their contracts with the township and work under state rules governing public employment situations.

Then the problems came.

Richards put forth a plan to combine the township's police and fire departments and create a single department of public safety. The proposal was for what is called nominal consolidation, meaning the administrative functions of the two departments would have been combined but the different staffs would have continued to specialize in police and fire work. With full consolidation, all personnel are trained in both police and fire fighting duties.

Richards maintains that the system would provide increased efficiency by avoiding certain duplications and establishing a coordinated budget process. The plan would have had the added benefit of putting Police Chief Chip Snider in the role of public safety director, a position in which the chief's superior managerial skills could have been utilized to the fullest.



Government

Opposition to the consolidation idea was not long in coming and went beyond the problems of territorial jealousy that could be expected with such a move. Fire Chief Ricke Rosselle is said to have been particularly resistant to the change, resenting the implication that he couldn't run a department as well as he could battle a blaze.

Apparently, Rosselle's displeasure was felt by other members of the fire department, and rumor soon spread about the possibility of a "palace revolt" in which fire fighters were supposed to plunk their gear down at the Board of Trustees table and walk out of township hall.

Fortunately, no such scene took place.

The controversy over the departmental consolidation plan seems to have unleashed a flood of pent-up hostility toward the new manager. Richards' detractors accused him of agenda tapping and of being unwilling to work with women. Members of the Board of Trustees now want to revisit some of his innovations, including the chain-of-command reform.

It appears as though Richards underestimated the number of obstacles he would encounter in trying to bring firm direction to a system that has languished in a virtual free-for-all environment for months, maybe years. We would counsel him to slow down and allow officials to absorb his suggestions at a pace with which they are comfortable.

As for the township's elected leaders and department heads, we would hope they would recognize that at long last Northville Township has a chief executive who can bring stability and professionalism to the township's governmental operations. The smart and proper thing to do would be to listen to him with an open mind and give him a chance to do what he was hired to do: manage.

Obits can be the death of you

Whoever said you're worth more dead than alive never had to pay for a funeral.

A friend of a friend had to make funeral arrangements for a relative recently, and the funeral home (not in this area) assessed a charge of \$60 to publish the death notice in *The Oakland Press*.

These folks obviously had other concerns, so they didn't give the fee a second thought and paid it.

The matter came to the fore, though, when the death notice came out wrong in the paper. It was a woman who had died, yet they listed her as the "beloved husband of..."

They wondered aloud to me what they had paid \$60 for. I said I had no clue because our paper charges no fee for death notices. We get 'em. We run 'em. That's that.

To me, it sounded like a rip-off. Either the funeral home was charging to deliver obituaries, or *The Oakland Press* was charging to print them, a foreign concept around here.

In any event, I told the family to call *The Press* to see if they'd run a corrected version of the death notice.

That call solved the mystery. Indeed, *The Oakland Press* does charge for obits. They run \$2.90 a line, so the one-

The Press phone operator, despite the bone-headedness of the blunder, wasn't apologetic in the least. She grudgingly agreed to rerun the item.

I can't say we've never made a mistake on an obituary. I can tell you this, though. The same death notice would have been free in this paper, and we'd gladly correct any errors.

While we're on the subject, there's a reason that we only deal with the funeral home in accepting obituaries.

It seems that about 15 or 20 years ago, someone at this paper accepted a death notice over the phone, only to have the alleged corpse show up at our front desk some time later to say, "Reports of my death have been greatly exaggerated."

We were the unwitting tool for someone's practical joke. Fortunately, the quite live victim of the prank saw the humor, and just asked us to run a correction.

The handwriting was on the wall, though. We could easily have gotten sued, so we now exercise due care and caution in the publication of death notices.

Some reminders for council

I have heard a lot of disturbing stories about the Novi City Council lately.

Actually, it hasn't been all that lately. For the past two years, I have been picking up bits and pieces from a variety of sources about council members who clearly have stepped over the bounds of proper conduct for municipal legislators.

Unfortunately, two of the worst offenders — Nancy Cassis and Joseph Toth — are running for mayor in November. But, they're not the only Novi council members who are guilty of inappropriate behavior.

What's more, some members of the Northville Township Board aren't any better and, in fact, may be worse.

With that in mind, it might be prudent to review a few of the rules of appropriate board member conduct.

Rule No. One is that elected council members are legislators — not administrators. Their jobs are to show up at city council and township board meetings and make policy decisions.

Their jobs are not to manage the government. Responsibility for the day-to-day operations belongs to the city or township manager.

When legislators — council or board members — begin to thrust themselves into operational matters, they are way out of bounds.

Rule No. Two is similar. Legislators deal only with the manager. When they begin dealing directly with department heads or other employees, they are exceeding their limits.

If a legislator seeks a question about government operations, it should be asked of the city or township manager who

will then get the answer for them from the appropriate employee.

When council members begin dealing directly with employees, the entire system starts breaking down. The manager answers to the council or board; all other employees answer to the manager.

In Novi, several council members have taken it upon themselves to send memos and directives directly to department heads and other employees. This disrupts the proper chain of command, undermining efficient operations and confusing (or alienating) employees.

Rule No. Three deals with decorum at the council table. Council members should behave professionally at all times toward all involved — a group that includes administrators, employees and the general public.

Publicly berating an administrator, employee or citizen is simply uncalled for. Intelligent people are able to discuss issues without attacking people personally. Personal attacks are unprofessional, unnecessary and out of line.

Both the Novi City Council and the Northville Township Board have several members who love to rant and rave, get quoted in the newspaper and put on a grand show for whoever's in the audience.

What they need to be told — and what they should remember — is that such behavior is impressive, but impressive in a negative context.

What's needed is more council members who are capable of listening, thinking and offering constructive discussion.

What's not needed is legislators who think they're administrators, who get involved in administrative matters and who place more importance on hearing their own voices than behaving responsibly.

The clerk intends to use the list of priorities to chart the board's future goals.

"I really do think we need to start focusing in our priorities," Hillebrand told trustees Thursday night. "I really think we've accomplished a lot, but I think we've been reacting to a lot of things that have come up too. I think this will make us more proactive."

Trustee Gini Britton agreed it was time to move ahead.

"I think it's good too because it allows us to do more than just put out fires," she said.

Hillebrand said Friday she wanted to re-focus the board because trustees were beginning to get sidetracked and bogged down in issues that were never priorities before. The clerk said she was prompted to the revisit the priority list after trustees tackled the proposal to merge the police and fire departments into a public safety department.

"I'm real tired of being asked to spend hours of time on issues that were never a priority. Public Safety is one of them," the clerk said Friday.

The clerk said she intends to take the short list of priorities the trustees drafted Thursday and comparing it to the list they compiled in December to see if anything has been left off. She'll also review the individual lists of 15 and add the issues that were close in the running behind the top vote getters to the final short list.

"We aren't going to be able to handle all of the issues, but it allows us to focus our priorities," she said.

McCotter opposes outlay for lights

Is Wayne County Commissioner Thaddeus McCotter being fiscally responsible, or is he doing his best imitation of Ebenezer Scrooge?

The commissioner, who represents Northville and Plymouth townships on the county commission, recently opposed the county's plan to borrow \$250,000 to put Christmas lights in Hines Park. McCotter said he opposes the idea because he doesn't think lights are a funding priority.

"In the wake of budget cuts designed to eliminate an \$11.7 deficit, Wayne County government has decided that borrowing \$250,000 to put up Christmas displays in Hines Park constitutes an emergency priority," McCotter wrote in a press release last week.

"We had residents of Northville and Plymouth Townships ask the county to improve public services,

but never to install Christmas lights. The issue sends taxpayers the clear message that the county has seriously misplaced its priorities . . ."

The proposal, which came from the County Parks and Recreation department, would be funded from money borrowed from the County's Extended Lease Financing Program. McCotter said an additional \$100,000 will be needed to pay people to install the display and to cover the expense of maintaining it. That money, the commissioner said, is expected to be recouped through a voluntary \$5 donation from each of the 60,000 cars the county anticipates will drive through the display.

McCotter balked at the county's traffic projection and said it had no evidence to support it.

"There has been no market study performed to show the feasibility of this event, no solicitation of private contributions, and no attempt to attract a private entrepreneur to per-

form this service either alone or in conjunction with the county. If this is such a great idea, why hasn't the private sector tried to do it?"

" . . . I cannot believe that every motorist travelling through this display is voluntarily going to give Wayne County \$5."

McCotter said the whole concept is mindboggling given the deficit the county is facing. He said he nixed the idea because he believes there are too many uncertainties and no guarantees that the county wouldn't be left holding the financial bag.

"Government must not do what it wants when it can't afford to do what it must. County general funds will ultimately be liable if this event fails to meet its elevated expectations and that is an irresponsible gamble given the county's budget problems."

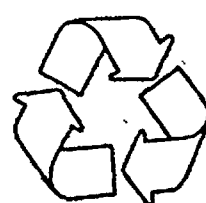

State's wines shine through rebuilding year

"I can't speak for the entire state, but I know that sales of St. Julian wines are up 10 percent this year," said owner Dave Braganini.

Annually, we've taken stock of the progress of Michigan's wine industry. It's healthy even after the disastrous 1992 growing season that could hardly be called summer.

"St. Julian's sales are booming outside Michigan in Illinois, Indiana and Nebraska," Braganini said. "For some producers up north, 1992 was a tough year because the crop never ripened, but our 1992 Riesling is the best we've made. The future continues to look bright. In 1993, we'll have a significant number of new plantings coming into production to bring our chardonnay close to 2,000 cases."

"People are buying our wines because they perceive value. In the \$5 range, we're as good as they get. Simply Red is our best seller at \$5."

In September, Great White will be introduced as a counterpart to Simply Red. It, too, will be \$5 and is a blend of chardonnay, vigneoles and riesling.

While Braganini deservedly touts his 1992 Riesling (\$8.50), we're putting all red wine lovers on alert for the 1991 St. Julian Chambourcin (\$8.50). Both wines are hard to beat at this price.

The number of Michigan wineries grew by three during the past year. Jack and Linda Stegenga will welcome you to their Bowers Harbor Vineyard (2896 Bowers Harbor Road, Traverse City, (616)223-7615).

From Traverse City, take M-37 (Center Road) 8.5 miles north on the Old Mission Peninsula to Seven Hills Road and turn left. Continue a half-mile and turn left on Bowers Harbor Road. The winery is on the left.

The Stegengas believe, as all vintners in that region do, that Old Mission Peninsula is a natural vineyard haven. The winery is producing chardonnay, Riesling and a methode champenoise Brut sparkling wine. Most impressive of all Bowers Harbor bottlings is the 1991 Reserve Chardonnay (\$12.75). Vanilla oakiness harmonizes well with gentle fruit. If you like your chardonnay with defined oak impressions, you'll find it attractive.

Grower Bob Begin has teamed up with Mark Johnson, former Chateau Grand Traverse winemaker for 10 years, to open Chateau Chantal (15900 Rue de Vin, Traverse City, (616)223-4110) in July. The unusual, retreat-like development is a 65-acre site replete with winery, vineyards, orchards, bed and breakfast, residence and six private homesites.

At the bed and breakfast, suites are \$115 and the Queen Room is \$85. A two-night minimum stay is required on weekends, June 15 to Oct. 30. From Traverse City, drive north 11 miles on M-37 and look for Chateau Chantal on the right.

"While the estate offers one of the most unique settings in northern Michigan, our business is wine," Johnson said. "Chateau Chantal is a must-see, must-visit wine retreat."

From Chateau Chantal, the 1991 Select Harvest Johannisberg Riesling (\$11) and the 1991 Select Harvest Gewurztraminer are solid examples of the varietals.

Rick Moersch, former Tabor Hill winemaker, has launched Heart of the Vineyard (10981 Hills Road, Baroda, (616)422-1617), a western Michigan wine-oriented getaway. Currently, wines are vinified and bottled at Fenn Valley Vineyards, but the winery's tasting room is in an 1881 post and beam bank barn.

There you can taste more than 20 varieties of sparkling, white, blush and red wines crafted by Moersch. It's hard for us to pick just one winner from among Moersch's offerings. They're all unusual. "With some of the wines, I only make a minuscule amount, he said. "It keeps me from getting bored. I was born to be a grape grower."

Rick and his wife, Sherrie, have recently remodeled a nearly 100-year-old country home

Spices suffice

You won't be sari learning Indian cooking

The newest teacher in the Northville school district puts some spice in her teaching, quite literally.

Sunetra Humbad a Royal Crown Estates resident will be teaching a series of five adult education classes in Indian Vegetarian cooking at Northville Schools this fall, beginning Sept. 27.

In six years, she's taught similar classes on eight different occasions in the Boston area. She and her family moved to Michigan recently, and Sunetra sees teaching as a way to meet people in the community.

"I wanted to do here what I did in Boston," says the petite native of India.

Sunetra learned as much from her former classes as her students did. Her first big lesson was to provide students with recipes.

"I don't ever use recipes," she said. "I just look at (what I'm cooking) and I do it. They wanted me to write it down, so in that first class I learned to write things down."

Most of the students who take Sunetra's class want to become vegetarians for health reasons. She doesn't blame them.

"I've never been sick in 16 years," she says. "The only time I've been to a hospital is to have two children."

"I have three friends here who've become vegetarians based on the recipes they've learned from me."

For the occasional feverish feeling, she recommends rose petal jam, a concoction taught to her by her grandmother. You have to use petals from organically grown pink roses in bloom (no other colors will work, Sunetra says). The petals are washed and pressed, then crushed by hand. Spread it with granulated sugar, and let it set in the sun for a while, and what comes out is a soothing sweet and pungent spread, just right on chapati bread.

Although the health aspects of Indian food are important, Sunetra views food as a way of meeting strangers and welcoming friends.

"Since I cook, I meet more people," she says. "We had 150 people in our house in India, so I like people very much. When someone comes to visit, you don't let them go away with an empty stomach. I was brought up that way."

"That's the way we say welcome. In America, some offer a drink. We offer food."

Cooking for the family is important, too. With four children in the house — sons Nilesh, Shalish and Parag, and daughter Mikhila — and husband, Niranjani, it's a way to gather everyone together. Indian cooking emphasizes balance. The diet consists of grains and beans for protein, bread, dairy products (again as a protein source) and, yes, even sweets, all in one meal.

"We don't go much for snacks," said Sunetra. "We usually eat two big meals a day."

The children have become somewhat Americanized, though. In that they enjoy something to munch on while watching television. For them, some spiced chick pea noodles, similar to what you'd find in a Chinese restaurant, make a great snack.

One thing's for certain; there's never a shortage of variety in the Humbad household. With the help of a friend, Sunetra has made preparations to publish a cookbook, and already has 135 recipes written down.

She's come a long way for someone who had never so much as boiled water for tea until she was married.

"I never liked cooking," she says. "At home we had 20 servants who did all the cooking and so forth. When I got married, my husband taught me how to prepare tea and rice. I cut and burned myself the first time I tried cooking."

That was 16 years ago, though. Friends and relatives showed her how to cook, and she brought the skills with her when she moved to the United States.

One skill Sunetra didn't bring with her though, was the ability to speak English.

"I couldn't communicate," she says. "My husband would sit next to me and talk, and I wouldn't understand."

The solution, she says, was soap operas. While taking an English class in the Boston area, she used daytime television as a learning tool. As a result, her English is beautiful, with one side effect: "I watched the soap operas and now I'm hooked."

An accent remains, but Sunetra can get around it with good humor. In repeating her name, she says, "You know, like the singer, Frank Sinatra."

Learning about Indian cooking means mastering the spices. There's a spice rack on the wall in Sunetra's kitchen, and in what might be the utensil drawer for an American cook, there's a small lazy Susan with tins of some of the most frequently used flavors: turmeric, hot pepper, a mustard seed mix, and garam masala (a mixture of cinnamon, cardamom, cloves, pepper and cumin).

Curry turns up often as well. Sunetra explains that

curry is not just one spice, but a name for a group of spice mixtures, which may vary. The one common ingredient in all curries is turmeric, but from there, the spicemaker's whim takes over. Curries may be yellow, green and even red, and may be hot or mild.

The bread, in flat round loaves called chapatis, is similar to the Mexican soft flour tortillas. Indian custom, Sunetra explains, is to forego utensils, using hunks of bread to pick up your food from the plate. Whereas dips are appetizers in the U.S., in India, your whole meal is a dip.

"I always teach people to eat by hand because it tastes better that way," Sunetra says. "And you must always use the right hand."

Lentil soup, flavorful and spicy hot, usually appears daily. Spices make up half the ingredient list for Sunetra's lentil soup recipe.

Where Americans may be used to ordinary white flour, Indian recipes call for whole wheat flour, or the more esoteric chick pea flour, which is high in protein. If you can't find it, a good substitute is equal parts white flour and cream of wheat.

Eating vegetarian, in addition to being healthy for you, is also less expensive. The trick is to go to an ethnic grocer (Sunetra says there are many Indian grocers

alongside Indian restaurants in Canton and east along Ford Road) to buy your spices and flours in measured quantities.

"Saffron is expensive, but other than that, (eating vegetarian) is not very expensive," she says. "In the supermarket, things are more expensive. But if you go to the smaller markets you can get them for less."

For Sunetra, vegetarianism is a religious choice. The family practices Jainism, a Hindu religion that resembles Buddhism. Among the religion's tenets is reverence for all living things.

"We're not to kill animals, because they have the same heart as we do," she said.

Some people take to vegetarianism slowly, but once they sample the vast array of flavors and sensations, Sunetra says they're hooked.

"One friend of mine wouldn't come eat at my house," Sunetra said. "You're poisoning me," she'd say. Now she jumps when I say come to my house for lunch."

As we head back to the New Bedford plant for a quick tour and exit lunch-

The New Bedford plant is much newer and state of the art than the one in Boston. "Cutting edge" as we say in the business. After a fast excursion about the factory, we end up around a conference table with Mike Foley at its head. He is telling us one final time that Foley's really cares.

While still in Boston, I called the restaurant and had a note posted for a kitchen meeting the following Sunday morning. For that hour and a half, I went over the significance of keeping the fish cold, handling minimally, keeping the skin on whenever possible, storing in the

shipping containers, portioning close to service, and proper cooking procedures.

It was one of the most rewarding meetings for me and the staff. Interesting stuff. We all learned, and better yet, have been following all the rules, and our restaurant is better for it. When I opened my "mission statement," it was fulfilled.

Mike then gave each of us a graduation "certificate," and we recessed to the test kitchen/dining room for some last minute treats. Soft shell crabs, oysters, clams, crab salad and cold beers sent us on our way.

By two o'clock, the van with everyone other than myself was on the way to the airport. We had said our good-byes and promised to look each other up if ever in

their town. I think we were probably the best group ever. Of course, there might be a bit of prejudice noted . . .

Driving back to the hotel I was anxious to start a short vacation with Tom, who would be waiting. We had that afternoon and evening to spend in Boston, and then off to Provincetown and a visit with my cousins. I'll fill you in next week.

Once again, thank you to everyone at Foley's for a fantastic educational experience. You'll be seeing more of my staff in the future.

Indian fare full of flavor and fire

1 medium tomato, chopped
2 inches of long, green hot pepper
2 tablespoons coriander leaves
¼ cup oily (or other) lentils
3 tablespoons corn oil
1 tablespoon brown sugar
1 tablespoon unsweetened coconut
1 teaspoon turmeric
1 teaspoon salt
pinch of hing (found at Indian grocery)
¼ teaspoon mustard seed mixture (see note)
4-5 Indian bay leaves
2 dried hot peppers
1½ teaspoon cumin/coriander powder
1 teaspoon hot red pepper powder
¼ teaspoon garam masala
¼ teaspoon other masala (or more garam masala)

Rinse lentils well, and cook in 3 cups water until soft, about 30 minutes. Place lentils in bowl with

turmeric and salt. Mix with a rotary beater until smooth.

In a saucepan, heat corn oil and add hing, mustard seed mix (NOTE: found at Indian grocer, or mix equal parts mustard seed, ground cumin and sesame seeds), bay leaves and dried hot peppers. Then add garlic, onion, tomato, fresh hot peppers and coriander leaves. Add brown sugar, coconut, cumin/coriander powder, red pepper powder, and masalas. Add lentil mixture and 1 cup water (or more for proper consistency) and cook until heated through.

The following is an after dinner pastry, usually reserved for special occasions like weddings.

CHICK PEA SWEET BALLS

2½ cups chick pea flour
¼ cup Crisco
¼ -½ cup ghee (recipe below)
powdered almond (optional)
2 cups granulated sugar

¼ teaspoon cardamom powder

In a saucepan, mix flour, Crisco, ghee and almonds. Saute over low heat, stirring well for 20-25 minutes until softened to the consistency of peanut butter, and slightly lumpy. Take off heat and cool, then add granulated sugar and cardamom powder. Mix well, and roll into 1-inch balls. Toss in palms to give shiny surface.

A key ingredient in many Indian dishes, ghee is a butter by-product.

GHEE

1 pound butter

Heat butter in saucepan until boiling and slightly brown. Pour off clear layer, which is the ghee.

The brown remainder in the pan may be mixed with ¼ tablespoon of sugar and eaten as a treat, much like licking frosting off the blades of a hand mixer.

Avoid accidents: mark containers

With so many food items that look like other household products, cleaning supplies, cosmetics or even medicines, extreme care must be taken to prevent accidental poisoning.

So cautions Sylvia Treitman, home economist for the Oakland County Cooperative Extension Service.

"One of the most dangerous things you can do is to transfer household cleaners out of their original containers," she said.

Sometimes containers appear so similar in color or shape that they can be accidentally mistaken for one another. Food items should never be stored with household chemicals, and medicines need to be either locked up or completely out of reach of young children.

Here are some tips to prevent poisoning by look-alike items:

■ Keep original labels on all foods,

household medicines, cleaners and other items.

■ Read labels and instructions before use.

■ Store medications separately from all other household products, including vitamins.

■ Never give or take medication in the dark.

■ Never refer to medication as "candy." Call it by the correct name. Keep all cleaners and medicines out of a child's reach or locked up.

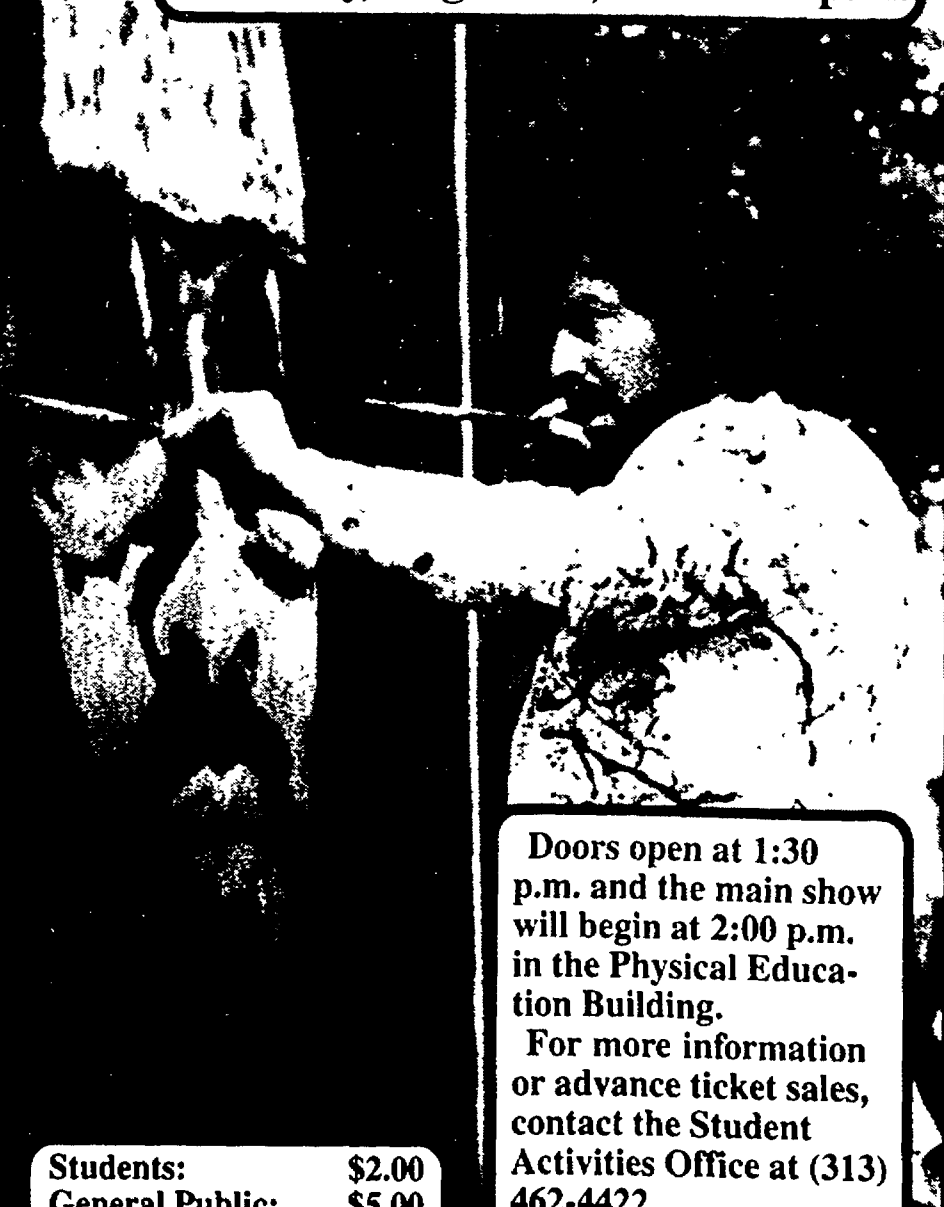

Freeze bounty now and enjoy in winter

Making jams and jellies isn't the only way to save your surplus produce. You can simply freeze it without a lot of prep work.

For help on the best way to freeze foods, pick up the 32nd edition of the Ball "Blue Book."

According to the authors, freezing is a good way to preserve foods because freezing retains the flavor, natural color and nutritive qualities of most foods better than other methods.

Most vegetables should be blanched and then frozen. Some fruits can be frozen whole without sugar, while others should be stored either in a sugar pack or syrup pack—a mixture of water or juice, sugar, ascorbic and citric acid to prevent discoloration.

Nothing could be easier than freezing berries. Use this method for blueberries, cranberries, strawberries and raspberries. Wash thoroughly, drain, pat dry, and put on cookie sheet in the freezer.

When berries are frozen, dump them into a resealable plastic freezer bag. While you're doing this, imagine how delicious fresh blueberry muffins will taste on a cold Sunday morning in February.

Plums can also be frozen whole without sugar. Wash, halve and pit plums. Pack the washed and drained plums in a plastic freezer bag, attempting to fill all space, seal and freeze.

For the best-tasting frozen vegetables, process on the day they're picked or bought. Vegetables to be stored or frozen for more than four weeks, except green onions, hot peppers and herbs, should be scalded. This cleanses the vegetables of dirt and organisms, brightens the color, helps retain vitamins and reduces the action of enzymes that would destroy the fresh flavor after about four weeks. Scalding also shrinks vegetables, making packing easier.

Before scalding, wash, drain, sort and trim vegetables as you would if you were cooking them fresh.

Use 1 gallon of water per pound of vegetables. Put vegetables into a blancher (wire basket, coarse mesh bag or perforated metal container) and lower it into vigorously boiling water.

Begin counting the time as soon as the vegetable is placed in the boiling water. Keep the heat on high and stir water, or keep container covered during blanching.

Cool the vegetables by immersing in ice water when scalding is complete. Pouring hot vegetables into a cool colander that's placed in ice water helps the vegetables cool quickly. Package, label and place in freezer.

Consult the Ball "Blue Book" or a basic cookbook, such as a Betty Crocker book, for vegetable-blanching times and more information on freezing fruits.

Kitchen rule says keep it clean

Every year between \$5 and \$17 billion are spent on medical costs and lost productivity as a result of food borne illnesses. Slaughter practices, limited inspections and food processing techniques can't be blamed for these high numbers. Blame some of this on us, the consumer.

One-third of food poisoning cases are caused by food prepared at home. We have the basic equipment in our kitchens to prevent most food borne illnesses; the stove, refrigerator and running water, but still forget the precautions.

Germ accumulate on your hands as you go from task to task. It is reported that most cases of diarrhea and vomiting are caused by inadequate handwashing. By not washing your hands thoroughly you can pass on a host of ailments to friends and family. These can range from the common cold to dysentery or hepatitis. The simplest way to avoid these infections is with a little soap and water. Just running water over your hands doesn't count as a washing.

Apply soap or detergent to your hands and rub vigorously for 10-20 seconds, then rinse. Germs tend to accumulate around cuticles, under fingernails and creases in your hands. It is critical to wash your hands before handling or eating food; after handling raw food, especially meat; after a visit to the bathroom; after blowing your nose or sneezing or coughing into your hand; after handling garbage; after playing with a pet; after changing a diaper or after handling money. Make vigorous hand washing a habit to stay healthy.

Next step to food safety is to keep your refrigerator set below 40 degrees and the freezer at or below 0 degrees. Slip meat packages into

another plastic bag or container prior to refrigeration. Juices from raw meat or poultry may leak from the original package and contaminate other foods or surfaces.

Ground meat tends to spoil faster than other cuts, so store ground beef, pork, lamb, turkey or poultry two days at the most. If you purchase jumbo-sized or family-sized packages of meat, make sure you follow the two-day guideline from the refrigerator or freeze it. You may also cook it all and then freeze it.

Store raw roasts and steaks in the refrigerator no longer than three to five days, raw chicken or turkey no longer than one to two days and leftover meats no longer than three or four days.

Never thaw foods, especially meat, at room temperature. The outside surface thaws before the inside, leaving the outside vulnerable to bacterial contamination and growth. Cook food frozen or thaw in the refrigerator.

Marinate meats and poultry only in the refrigerator. Don't put cooked meat back into uncooked marinade or on a plate that previously held raw meat. If you do, you're passing the bacteria back and forth. Don't trust your nose to pick up bacteria smell. Bacteria growth is odorless.

Never use utensils that have touched raw meat or poultry without a thorough washing. Everything that comes in contact with the raw meat should be washed immediately. Don't contaminate other foods or hands by cleaning up drippings from raw meat.

Wash your cutting board with hot soapy wa-

ter or put it in the dishwasher. Occasionally wash it with a mild bleach solution and rinse with clean water. Cross contamination from raw to a cooked product is a common mistake that can be avoided with some thought.

Some foods can be eaten raw but meat and poultry aren't on that list. Steak tartare may be considered a delight to your taste buds; however, it could be dangerous to your health. Most health authorities discourage any consumption of raw meat.

Cook hamburger meat thoroughly. Hamburger meat is riskier than steaks or other cuts because it has so much surface area. Cook until no pink shows in the center. Rare beef does carry some bacterial risk, so you make the choice. Cook meat to an internal temperature of at least 160 degrees. Red meat when done is brown or grey inside, and the juices in poultry run clear.

Cooking meat perfectly means careful timing and temperature. A very high heat will harden the protein and make meat tough and dry. When grilling or broiling, the timing is extremely important.

Recent deaths and serious illnesses from fast food hamburger really underscore the importance of food safety at home and away. Heat destroys most bacteria so use good judgement when cooking meats and keep your work space and hands clean.

Proper food handling will help eliminate food borne illnesses. Who needs a headache or stomach ache anyway?

Dessert book deserves a look

The adage that a picture is worth a thousand words is especially true when it's illustrating a complicated recipe.

The Good Housekeeping Illustrated Book of Desserts, edited by Mildred Ying, and published by Hearst Books of William Morrow and Co. Inc. (\$25), uses pictures to make elaborate dessert-making easy.

Also accompanying the recipes are little tricks to make the desserts look good as well as taste good.

If pretty and imaginative desserts are your goal, this book has plenty of ideas. The recipe for Dreamy Chocolate Cake includes directions on how to make the grated chocolate curls to go along the edges of the completed cake. Cannoli Cake features instructions for making a feather design on the top.

The Creamy Rice Pudding recipe is topped off with a cinnamon lattice design. We tried this one out on guests at a party, and although we didn't get the lattice design as perfect as the picture, it was still impressive.

For the same party, we made the Double-Chocolate Mousse Cake. We were hesitant to try out new recipes on guests, but the picture was too pretty to resist. We had some trouble keeping the mousse in one piece when

transferring it to the cake plate, but once it was glazed, it looked great. The trick is to put waxed paper between the cake and the serving plate to catch the glaze drippings. Once the glaze is set, trim off the messy edges. A whipped cream border along the edge makes it look like a professional made it.

Chocolate lovers will find many confections to their liking, such as the Marbled Mousse, Individual Chocolate Souffles with coffee cream and the Chocolate Box with berries and cream that features directions on how to make a chocolate box.

And the section on decorative pie edges shows how to spice up an ordinary pie recipe by making fancy fluted edges, leaf edges, ruffled edges and braided edges.

Some of the directions rely on basic cake-decorating skills such as how to pipe the borders on the Valentine Cake. Beginners could have problems completing the shell and ruffle designs.

Other recipes make use of fresh fruits for their appeal, such as the Flag Cake, which uses raspberries and blueberries to make a Stars and Stripes design on the top.

Also included in this 320-page book are information and instruc-

tions for icings, fillings, sweet sauces and meringues and pastry piping.

Included in the cookie section are 28 recipes with such tempters as Brandy Snaps, Two-Tone Hearts, Apricot Rugelach and Crispy Snowflakes.

More than 200 recipes are included, with chapters on cakes, pies, tarts and pastries, cookies and frozen desserts as well as special desserts such as mousses and souffles, custards and creams, crepes, blintzes and meringues.

CREAMY RICE PUDDING
(Begin about 2 hours before serving or early in the day.)

2 quarts milk
¼ teaspoon salt
1 cup regular long-grain rice
¼ cup dark seedless raisins
½ cup sugar
1 tablespoon vanilla extract
2 12-ounce cans evaporated milk
4 large eggs
ground cinnamon
fresh or Maraschino cherries for garnish

In 4-quart saucepan over medium heat, heat milk and salt to simmering; stir in rice. Reduce heat to low;

cover and simmer 45 to 50 minutes until rice is very tender and mixture is thick, stirring occasionally. Stir in raisins.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit. Grease 13-by-9-inch baking dish; set in large roasting pan.

In large bowl, with wire whisk or fork, beat sugar, vanilla extract, evaporated milk and eggs until blended; gradually stir in hot rice mixture.

Place baking dish in pan on oven rack; carefully pour rice mixture into baking dish (mixture will almost fill dish). Fill roasting pan with boiling water to come halfway up sides of baking dish. Bake 40 to 45 minutes until knife inserted in center of pudding comes out clean.

Make cinnamon lattice on top of pudding. Hold ruler diagonally across one corner of baking dish, about 1 inch from edge of pudding. Holding cinnamon jar in other hand, evenly shake spice through sprinkler held along ruler edge. Shake excess spice off ruler. Repeat at 1-inch intervals. Repeat in opposite direction to form lattice pattern.

To serve garnish with refrigerated cherries. Serve warm or refrigerate to serve cold later. Serves 16.

into a bed and breakfast facility just around the corner from Taber Hill winery. Cost is \$95 with a two-night minimum stay on weekends from Memorial to Labor Day.

To reach the winery, take I-94 exit 16 then travel north to Lake/Shawnee Road. Turn right (east) four miles to Hills Road. Turn right (south) and go 1.5 miles on the South Bend U.S. 31 bypass to Snow Road. Turn left and go eight miles to Hills Road. Follow winery signs from that point.

Leelanau Wine Cellars continues to improve its quality. The 1992 Chardonnay (\$10) is fruity and dry. Tall Ship Chardonnay Reserve (\$13) is its fuller counterpart. Vis a Vis white and red (\$11) are value-priced drinking. Leelanau's fruit wines are outstanding. Both the apple and peach are winners at \$6.

The state's best sparkling wine producer Larry Mawby is recuperating well from a bout with colon cancer. Mawby was hit hard by last year's non-summer. His late ripening red varietals didn't ripen and there will not be any 1992 Vignoles.

Always the innovator, Mawby has

introduced a new blended off-dry white dubbed Moira (\$7.80) after the Greek goddess of fate because as Mawby put it "it reflects the fate of the vintage." A red blend (also reflective of the fate of the 1992 vintage), and as yet unnamed, will be introduced in September.

Brut Cuvee 5, Brut Cremant and Brut Rose (all \$15) continue to beat the socks off any sparkler in this price range.

'Brisco County' hits target with Western adventure

What may very well emerge as the first big hit of the new fall TV season gallops into view. Friday, Aug. 23, as "The Legend of Brisco County, Jr." premieres on Fox with a special two-hour episode.

The action-adventure series, set in the Old West, follows the exploits of Brisco County Jr. (Bruce Campbell), an adventurer with a Harvard law degree. After his father, a revered marshall, is killed by John Bly (Billy Drago) and his band, Brisco is hired by five wealthy robber barons (one of them played by guest star Stuart Whitman) to round up several outlaws, including his father's murderers. He teams up with nervous attorney Socrates Poole (Christian Clemenson) and clashes with rival bounty hunter Lord Bowler (Julius Carry).

Other colorful characters crossing Brisco's path include Pete Hutter (John Pyper-Ferguson), a hysterically high-strung gunslinger with an unwholesome attachment to his pistol; Dixie Cousins (Kelly Rutherford), the well-known saloon singer and seductress; and eccentric Professor Wickwire (John Astin), an

inventor who detects a kindred spirit in Brisco.

And then there's the Orb, a UFO (unearthed foreign object) of immense and mysterious power, that will figure in a number of this year's episodes.

"Brisco" is Fox's best hope for a big breakout hit this year, and network executives are making no secret of the fact that they think the handsome Campbell (who starred in the "Evil Dead" horror movies) will be the Next Big Thing. While it remains to be seen how the series will hold up week after week, make no doubt about it: The opener is a stunning rollercoaster ride, with a climactic sequence aboard a runaway train that will have potatoes on the edge of their couches.

Given the series' Western setting, it's not hard to draw parallels to "The Wild, Wild West," the 1965-70 CBS series starring Robert Conrad and Ross Martin as agents James T. West and Artemus Gordon. In both tone and content, however, "Brisco" actually owes more to the "Indiana Jones" films: It's not a Western as much as an adventure series that just happens to take place in the Old

West. And, unlike Conrad's cool-as-ice Agent West, Campbell's Brisco is resourceful but flawed: Tie him to a railroad track in front of an oncoming train and he'll break into a sweat every time.

In the premiere, all concerned go about their duties with cocky self-assurance. These are seasoned actors who are reveling in a snappy script and the first-rate production values surrounding them and their delight is tangible.

Drago's Bly is a villain of Shakespearean scale, while Pyper-Ferguson plays the hilariously unhinged Pete like a scrappy terrier on caffeine. Clemenson is an ice foil for Campbell, while Carry (who will continue to make guest appearances as Murphy Brown's boss on CBS this season) remains one of the best "reactors" in the business. Astin is, as always, a wiggly delight, but the show's major discovery next to its leading man, of course) is whiskey-voiced Rutherford, a knockout blonde who can push a seduction scene right up to the borderline of farce, then pull back just before it goes over the top.

"Brisco" may or may not be able to keep the magic flowing week in and week out. But man, oh man, anyone who loves cheeky, breezy entertainment delivered with style and wit won't want to miss Friday's debut.

Carradine must be contacted; 'Curves' returns to late night

Q: I'm very interested in obtaining some information on David Janssen of the TV series "The Fugitive." Could you please print something about him? I realize he has been gone for a long time, but it's hard to find anything on him now. -S. Burke, Truro, Nova Scotia.

A: Janssen starred as Dr. Richard Kimble in the popular ABC series "The Fugitive," a role now occupied by Harrison Ford in the motion picture release of the same name. Born in Naponee, Neb., in 1930 to a Miss America runner-up, he made his film

debut in 1946's "Swamp Fire." He landed minor theatrical and television roles before achieving stardom as the title character in producer Dick Powell's "Richard Diamond, Private Detective." After a successful three-year run on the show, Janssen made guest appearances on "The Millionaire" and "Zane Grey Theater" before landing his most famous role in "The Fugitive." The series, which ran from 1963-1967, told the story of Kimble, a doctor wrongly accused of murder, as he fled the law and pursued the real killer, a mysterious one-armed man. Subsequent forays into feature films, including "Macho Callahan," "The Green Berets" and "Once is Not Enough," failed to fully utilize his talent. Soon he was back on TV in "Harry-O," "Centennial" and television movies including "Smile, Jenny, You're Dead" (the pilot for "Harry-O"), "A Sensitive, Passionate Man," "High Ice" and his last role, "City in

Fear." Janssen died suddenly of a heart attack on Oct. 28, 1980.

Q: What happened to Davey Allison was tragic. We enjoyed watching his racing career. Where can we write to send our condolences? -Ken and Nancy Humbert, Portland, Ore.

Tori Hayden (Megan Connolly) is Cassie's best friend and she has an on-again, off-again crush on Kirk.

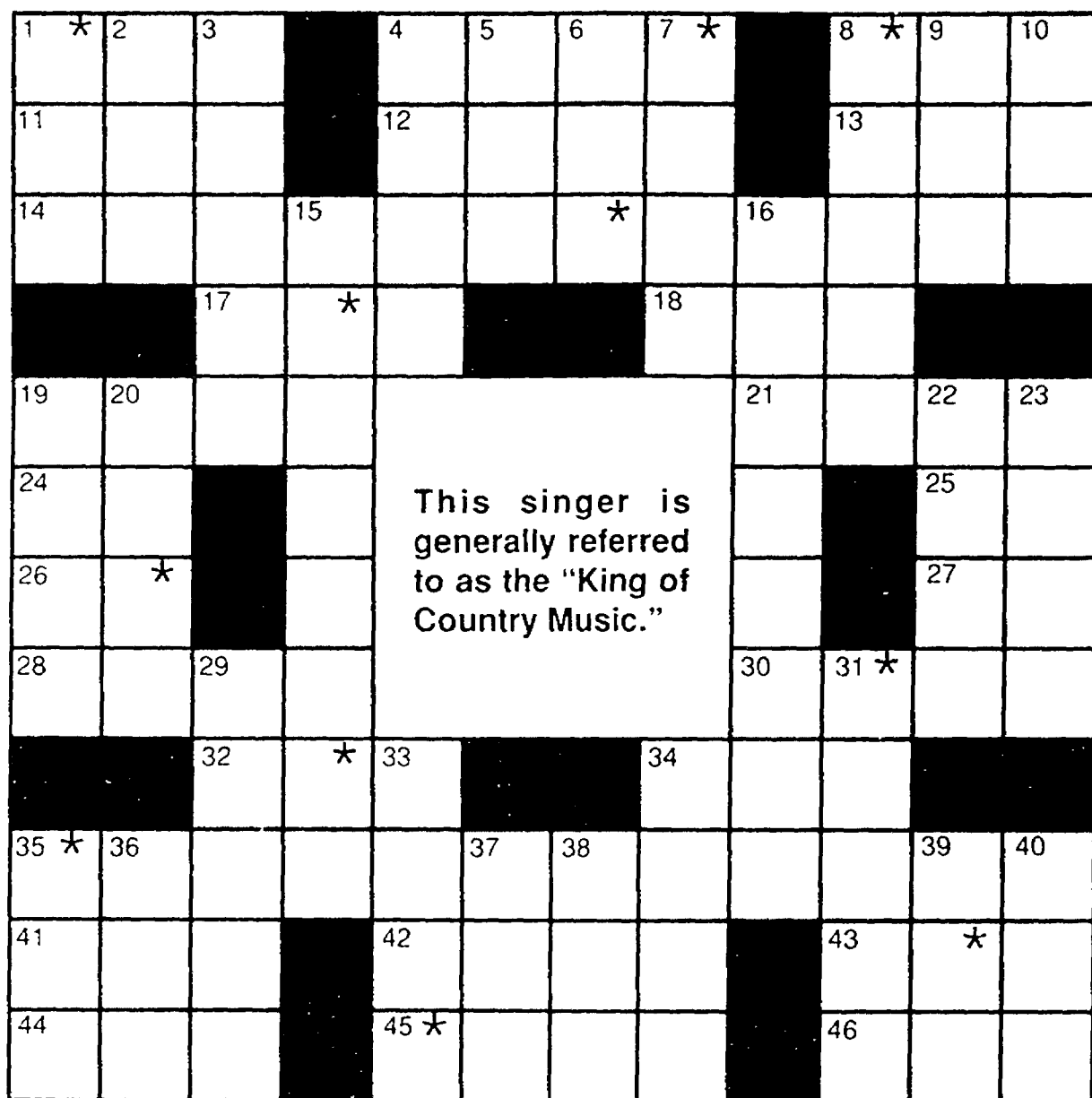
Roy McDermott (John Holding) is Sean's suburban best friend. Things never seem to go his way.
