

Report highlights year for schools

Northville School District officials would agree the high point of the 1992-93 school year was the approval of the district's millage election in June.

But before anyone could finish breathing a sigh of relief, the rules of the school-finance game changed with the approval of Senate Bill 1.

The bill, signed by Gov. John Engler over two weeks ago, puts a stop to schools relying on property taxes as a main source of revenue. The average taxpayer will see a two-thirds reduction in his or her tax bill when the measure takes effect in July 1994.

But as the school year started on the heels of a millage defeat, it ended on a millage note, only a more positive one for school officials.

Both millages served as the basis for the annual end-of-the-year reports, shared by Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski at last week's Northville Board of Education meeting.

The reports serve as a permanent record of activities for that school year. Intended to serve more as a reminder of accomplishments for the year, each department is responsible for submitting a brief report.

In Rezmierski's report, he highlighted the following:

- The board approved a 1.5-mile magnet program as a compromise for providing transportation services.
- Citizen input led to the board's authorization of the pay-to-participate athletic and co-curricular program.
- The district is participating in a "friendly lawsuit" against the state in conjunction with 12 other districts, attempting to halt the "Robin Hood" tax sharing bill.
- The district joined forces with seven organizations, including the Michigan Out of Formula Districts Association, several superintendents' associations and the Wayne County Regional Education Services Agency.

Twp. officials to review plans for Haggerty development

Northville Township planners will review the first of several site plans intended to develop Haggerty Road at Tuesday night's planning commission meeting.

The proposed WindRidge planned unit development, a 64-acre mixed residential and commercial project, will be the subject of the first of three public hearings set for tomorrow night.

WindRidge is one of the first of the projects that will test the township's new adopted Haggerty Road Planned Unit Development option. Planners recently altered plans for Haggerty Road after they adopted the mixed-use planning option.

Under PUD's, developers have the

option of the proposing single projects with mixed uses.

WindRidge, which is being developed by Victor International at Seven Mile Road, will be the first to test the new ordinance.

Developers of the WindRidge project are seeking preliminary site plan approval for their proposed development which envisions a 75 percent residential and 25 percent retail mix.

According to the plan, 47.9 acres of the lot will be used to build 100 1/4-acre single-family homesites. A Home Depot, a massive do-it-yourself home improvement center, and a restaurant are also being proposed to satisfy the commercial component of the PUD.

While planners will review the

Restaurateur to try again for deck for Woolly Bully's

Township hall observers will be watching to see if Woolly Bully's owner Mark Roman sticks around long enough Tuesday for township planners to hear his proposal for parking lot expansion and an outdoor service deck.

Roman stormed out of an Aug. 10 Northville Township planning commission meeting after planners denied his request for additional parking at the Seven Mile Road location.

The night club owner was angry over the denial and left the meeting before commissioners could review the proposed deck, which has been tabled for months now at Roman's request.

Planners and Roman will meet again Tuesday to review a revised plan for expanded his parking lot. It's unclear whether the deck will be reviewed Tuesday night. But the latest version of the plan addresses the concerns planners voiced about the previous plan at the Aug. 10 meeting.

The revised plan includes 94 new parking spaces to be built on the .93-acre parcel Roman intends to lease from CSX Railroad. The 17 spaces that Roman couldn't get approved by commissioners three weeks ago have been eliminated from the revised plan. In their place are six new spots that have been added to the front and rear of the restaurant.

Roman's new plan will also need far fewer variances from the Zoning Board of Appeals than his last version.

The restaurateur needs more parking to meet the township ordinance.

Even though planners are simul-

taneously working to amend the township parking ordinance, Roman is entitled to meet the requirements of the former one. Under that ordinance, the restaurant owner is required to have 164 spaces. He has only 77 now.

Planning Commissioner Sue Vlangos has in the past been concerned about approving the expansion without taking into consideration the additional seating capacity the proposed deck will create.

While Roman contends the 1,554 square-foot deck won't add any additional capacity and instead just disperse the crowd, some township officials disagree.

Township planning consultants, McKenna Associates, say the deck will add capacity and require 31 additional parking spaces under the present ordinance.

Planners will discuss Roman's requests Tuesday night during the regular commission meeting, which follows the scheduled public hearings.

Officials swap school land with developer

When the Northville Board of Education purchased 129 acres of land in the early 1970s, members thought the wooded area toward the back of the Six Mile property would make a perfect nature site for students.

Environmental studies could be conducted on the wetland area not suitable for the construction of a school building, board members thought.

"Times were different then," David C. Bolitho, assistant superintendent for administrative services, told current board members at a special meeting Thursday night. "Money was not as tight as it is now."

The unusable property is now out of the district's hands after board members approved the acquisition and trade of property with local developer Mark Guidobono. In the agreement, the district will keep 52 acres on the Six Mile site, selling Guidobono the surplus land for \$1,575,000. The Six Mile property is located on the north side of the road, between Beck and Sheldon roads.

In addition, the district will purchase 40 acres of land on Eight Mile Road near Garfield, located in

Novi, for \$500,000 from Guidobono.

Ted Martin, the district's real estate consultant, told board members there were four benefits to inking the land deal.

"(The back of the Six Mile site) is not good for a school building site," he said. "To keep it for a school site would not make good sense. It does, however, make for good luxury home sites."

About one-quarter of the property is wetlands, too, which also made the property undesirable to the school district.

The property, situated in Northville Township, would also be put on the tax rolls once the purchase was completed. It is now exempt because of the school district's ownership of the land.

Another benefit of the deal is that the 52 acres on the Six Mile site kept by the school is level, clear and located at the front of the property.

"It is clearly the best site for building a school," Martin said.

The Eight Mile property is located about a mile south and half-mile west of Thornton Creek Elementary, the district's newest school building constructed this year.

"The growth is clearly in that direction," Martin said. "It started about four years ago with what

once looked like cornfields are now subdivisions."

Martin said there is one small wetland on the property, but it is not regulated by the Department of Natural Resources or Novi because it's under two acres. The wetland could be filled or developed into a retention pond, Martin said.

Once the properties are traded and Guidobono credits the school district the \$500,000 for the Novi property, the developer will owe a balance of \$1,075,000 on a five-year land contract.

The terms of the purchase agreement allow the parties 180 days to close on the deal. In the event the closing is not completed before Dec. 31, Guidobono agrees to assume the tax liabilities on the entire Novi parcel, of which he will own 117 acres surrounding the school district's newly acquired 40 acres.

The developer has also agreed to provide two 5-foot-wide access walkways from his Northville property to the adjacent school property for children walking to school.

Trustee Joan Wadsworth showed her concern over the project with the many questions she fired to the developer and real estate agent. She cast the

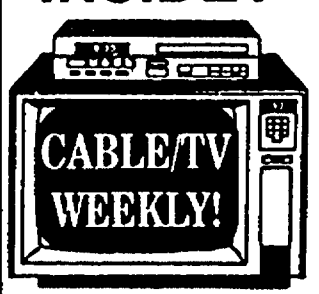

to effectively deal with state mandates. There were 300 mandates during the school year, according to Rezmierski.

● Legislators started listening to the district in part thanks to the formation of the PTA's Legislative Action Network (LAN).

"There's been a radical change," Rezmierski said. "Now I get calls from our legislators while they're on the Senate or House floors."

● Construction of Thornton Creek. Although the school will not open this fall as originally hoped, the building was finished under budget.

"This doesn't mean, though, that our goal for opening Thornton Creek in 1994 is lost by a long shot," Rezmierski told board members.

● Attention was given to redrawing boundaries for elementary and middle schools. The effort provided school officials with reasonable estimates of student population growth.

● A very favorable audit report is expected. Cost-saving measures implemented during the year netted the district in over \$200,000 in savings.

● Many honors were shared among staff including Shirley Klokeng's Middle School WDIW/Newsweek Teacher of the Year designation. Jan Tiplady and Darrel Schumacher,

teachers from the elementary and high schools, respectively, were runners up for the award on the local level.

● MEAP scores were "outstanding" with Northville students placing within the top 10 percent of the state.

"It doesn't mean we're satisfied where they (scores) are, we have a long way to go," Rezmierski said.

● Students also enjoyed success with 160 high school students receiving in excess of \$500,000 in awards and scholarships.

● The football, boys basketball and girls soccer teams competed successfully to the regional finals. The high school plays and choir and band

concerts were also successful.

● Northville was selected as a host site for the National School Board Association. The visit was made to study the district's technology system. Following the event, the district received a \$4,500 grant to continue its computer technology efforts.

● The district, with help from 100 citizens, redefined its strategic plan.

● The district joined forces with the city and township of Northville and chamber of commerce to create a common vision.

"We can come together," Rezmierski said of what he referred to as the QUAD meetings. "This is one community. It isn't so big that we get

lost in the fog."

● The Board of Education met over 70 times, including 22 regular board meetings; eight special call meetings; nine study sessions; eight curriculum, six facility, six finance, two personnel and 10 policy sub-committee meetings; and numerous executive sessions.

"The level of commitment on behalf of this board well purports the strength of this community," Rezmierski said.

Board president Robert McMahon said he was surprised when he saw the break-down of the past year's

meeting schedule.

"This is a very dedicated group of individuals," he said.

He also praised Rezmierski's secretary Marge Dobbs for her dedication and always being that "friendly voice on the other end of the phone."

Treasurer Richard Brown said he appreciated the administration's end-of-the-year report.

"Sometimes we lose sight in May of what we accomplished in October," he said. "We did accomplish a lot. Not everything, but we did accomplish a lot and we should be very proud of that."



lone dissenting vote on the board's decision to approve the purchase agreement. Secretary Glenna Davis and Trustee Patricia Custer were absent from the meeting.

"We are a part of the community," Wadsworth said. "We want to be responsible to the community. We need to maintain some measure of control to the amount of kids (developments) bring into the township. The quality of education we offer to the kids is affected by the number of kids."

Wadsworth asked how the land around the school's Northville Township property would be developed. Guidobono said the configuration of the property would result in some odd-shaped lots, but lot sizes would probably average between 120- to 125-foot frontage to 180- to 200-foot deep.

"It depends on the planning process and the approvals we have to get from Northville Township," Guidobono said.

The developer estimated 50 to 85 houses would be built on the 63 buildable acres of what he hopes will be the most desirable subdivision in the township.

It would probably take about seven to eight years to complete the building project.

"A lot of it depends on the economy, too," Guidobono said. "The last two years have been very slow in this market."

Wadsworth asked if the Edenderry neighborhood, located north of the proposed development, would be affected by the construction.

"They've enjoyed that wooden area there," she said. "Would you keep that as a buffer?"

Guidobono said it would depend on whether the township required him to put a road on the property line. "We don't want to, but it may be part of their master plan," he said. "We're hoping with the proximity to the wetlands, they won't make us do it."

Martin said he talked to township officials and indicated they weren't interested in extending Curtis Avenue.

The purchase agreement was examined by attorney Chatt Heckemeyer of Keller, Thoma, Schwarze, Schwarze, DuBay and Katz, P.C. The attorney pointed out the agreement's release provision, which allows Guidobono to develop the property as long as he makes payments.

Guidobono has also made a \$50,000 deposit. If the defaults on the agreement, the district has the option of suing Guidobono or keeping the deposit for liquidated damages

thereby terminating the agreement. If the school district defaults, Guidobono has the option of seeking legal action.

"How can we default?" Richard Brown, treasurer of the board, asked. Heckemeyer said only if the district couldn't deliver a clear title to the land or if it simply decided it wouldn't conform to the purchase agreement.

The attorney called the agreement a reciprocal one.

"It's mutual protection to the school district and Mr. Guidobono," he said.

"The way this has been packaged, the interest of the school district has been protected," Robert McMahon, board president, said.

Trustee Jay Dunkerley said a property trade was discussed during a past strategy session.

"At the time the (Six Mile) land was acquired there were no such things as wetlands or woodlands," he said. "From a school standpoint it diminished the value of the property."

"Well we now have two buildable sites instead of one," Jean Hansen, vice-president of the board, added. "We're not limiting ourselves by doing this."

tients to drink excessive amounts of water.

Northville Regional Psychiatric Hospital Director Dr. Walter Brown was expected to make the opening remarks at today's 1:30 p.m. ribbon cutting ceremony to dedicate the new ward.

Brown's comments will be followed by remarks from Dr. Krishnappa Reddy and Dr. Tariq Abbasi, the two psychologists instrumental in the development of the new ward.

"We know that we are one of the few hospitals involved with researching this," Brown said Friday afternoon. "We are on the cutting edge of trying to deal with this problem."

The hospital director said Northville's facility is one of few state hospitals that have recognized the problem and have built a ward to specifically treat the water disorder. He said in the past doctors at hospitals across the country have dealt with the prob-

lem in mainstream treatment and few have attempted to treat it as an isolated problem.

"In the past we have had one-to-one supervision," he said. "We watched the patient around the clock, but that has not been successful in treating the problem."

"We think it is a specific enough problem that it demands a lot of attention," Brown said.

Brown said the new ward will use a behavioral approach to treating polydipsia. The condition can, in extreme cases, be fatal. The patients with the most severe cases of the disorder will be transferred to the ward. There, Brown said professionals will use a behavior modification approach to curb the disorder.

To treat the disorder, doctors will be looking for a baseline behavior that they want to modify. Once the behavior is identified, doctors will devise a system to reward and reinforce good behavior.

"We are looking at how we can

change this particular behavior," he said. "It can be very dangerous," he said. "These patients have a water drinking problem. They drink water to excess, and it can cause other serious physical problems."

Brown said there has been little research to date on the disorder. He said of the research that has been done, there is little evidence to indicate the cause of it. Brown said hospital staff will keep detailed statistics on the progress of treating the disorder in the hopes of finding a common thread between cases that could identify a cause and a cure.

"We are hoping to produce some research for ourselves on this disorder," he said. "We think that we have a good treatment for the disorder now, but we want to see if it works."

He said the ward will take a holistic approach to treating polydipsia by looking at the cause, treatment, intervention and the results.

"We are looking for relationships between diagnosis, age, sex, and the

number of hospitals patients have been in to see if there is any correlation," he said.

Brown said Drs. Reddy and Abbasi helped to write the proposal for the new ward that was funded solely by hospital funds. Brown said the hospital didn't have any grant monies from the state's department of mental health to back the project, but he hoped someday that research done in the Northville hospital would prove worthy of state funded grants.

Brown said the ward has no specialized, high tech equipment. Instead, its new decor will serve as a model for refurbishing the rest of the hospital.

"It is a nice, homey atmosphere that lends itself to good treatment and good interaction between staff and patients," he said.

"We are very proud of this endeavor," he said. "This hospital has been trying real hard to be in the forefront of treating mental illnesses. We would like to continue that."

plans for the residential portion and for the Home Depot, they will not be eyeing blueprints for the proposed restaurant on Tuesday.

The township planners, McKenna Associates Inc., have endorsed the project, but have recommended some changes. They say even though

the land is zoned for large office, the proposed uses are allowable under the Haggerty Road Planned Unit Development option.

The consultant's memo on the project indicates that the proposed development is compatible with and included in the PUD plan for the entire Haggerty Road corridor, which is

currently being reviewed by township planners.

When planners first saw the plans for the 64-acre parcel, consultants thought the number of proposed parking spaces for the retail aspect of the plan exceeded the number needed. Developers have responded

to the township's concern by reducing the number of spaces from 700 to 559.

Planners are expected to hear the community's reaction to the project at the public hearing which starts at 7:30 p.m. and then vote on the site plan later in a regular public meeting.

Jogger evades abduction

A 25-year-old Northville female flagged down two men in a car traveling near Six Mile Road and Hines Drive and told them a white male attempted to abduct her while she was jogging on Thursday at 11 p.m.

The woman refused to file a report with township police but the two men who picked her up after the incident did. According to the report, the men said the victim was crying when she flagged them down. The men who were from Canton and Plymouth drove the woman back to her car and then notified township police. Officers called the woman and asked her for a description and a composite of the suspect. She said she was jogging when the man came up behind her, grabbed her by the arm and pulled her towards him. 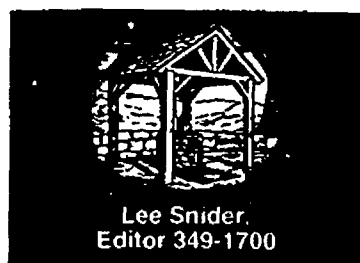

Haggerty development shows early promise

A few months back, Northville Township planners changed their approach to development along the Haggerty Road corridor.

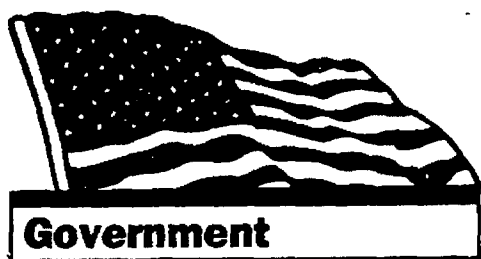
Instead of amending the township's master plan to stray from the large office zoning that dominates the corridor from Eight Mile to Five Mile roads, they opted to introduce the Haggerty Road Planned Unit Development program to accommodate select parcels in the three-mile stretch.

This is a unique and creative concept that, we believe, could provide a framework for realizing optimal benefit from the prime real estate in that area.

The PUD option, which is used widely in other communities, is a useful planning device which allows developers and planners to design custom developments with multiple zoning uses. In communities where the PUD ordinance has been implemented, the option has provided municipal officials with a high degree of control over large-scale planning efforts.

The township's first PUD project to land on the planners' agenda is WindRidge, a 64-acre complex near Seven Mile that splits its land use between residential and retail functions.

Approximately 100 single-family, detached homes will nestle up next to a Home Depot store, the east coast-based home improvement chain, and an upscale restaurant that will face Haggerty Road.



Behind the WindRidge proposal is Victor International, an accomplished development firm with well established office/retail complexes on the east side of Haggerty in the city of Livonia.

While we recognize that WindRidge is just one of many projects looming on the Haggerty Road horizon, we don't think it's premature to applaud township planners for the initiative and insight they've shown to help understand and combat the disease.

Adopting and implementing the PUD could allow the township to package commercial/retail projects into residential developments, thereby adding needed tax base while retaining the bedroom community environment Northville Township residents are eager to preserve.

The PUD option seems to offer the versatility to accommodate residential growth even as it leaves the door open for much needed commercial and retail development. It could be just the tool that's needed to produce an even more vital and diverse local economy.

Hospital blazes trail with wing dedication

Officials of Northville Regional Psychiatric Hospital are to be congratulated for the effort that will culminate in today's dedication of a new wing of the facility.

This afternoon, hospital officials will cut the ribbon on a refurbished wing that will serve as a center for the treatment of polydipsia, a strange disorder in which the patient consumes dangerously high quantities of water.

The sickness afflicts a significant segment of the mentally impaired population and can be fatal in extreme cases.

The new wing will provide a means of offering specialized treatment for sufferers and could also become a venue for basic research on polydipsia. Little is known about the nature and cause of the malady, and the treatment of addicts at Northville could furnish crucial data needed to help understand and combat the disease.

With today's dedication, Northville Regional Hospital takes its place alongside health care facilities that are exploring little known areas of human distress. Courage and a pioneering spirit are required to undertake such a task, and we wish them every success in their endeavor.

Are papers doing their job?

Test-time, folks. In terms of teacher contracts, how many of you know what an increment is?

Hopefully, a lot of you raised your hands. Hopefully, a lot of you know that teachers receive an incremental raise for "experience" every year through their first 10-11 years of employment. After 10-11 years (it varies from school district to school district, but 11 years is fairly typical), they are at the top of the scale.

Understand that the incremental raise is quite different from the negotiated raise.

Let's say, for example, that teachers agree to a new contract which calls for a 5 percent increase. What that means is that everyone at the top of the scale gets a 5 percent hike.

However, teachers who are not at the top of the scale receive the 5 percent negotiated increase on top of their incremental increase.

For example, Northville teachers received a negotiated increase of 5.85 percent at the start of the 1992-93 academic year. A nice increase to be sure, but teachers with up to 11 years experience actually received total pay hikes ranging from 10.54 to 15.07 percent when the increments were added to the negotiated increase.

Pretty hefty hikes when the private sector is granting 2-4 percent increases. And you wonder why I get angry when kids are forced to "pay to participate" in extracurricular activities. In my estimation, this is the root of the school financing problem.

But this column is not about teacher salaries or the financial problems of public education. It's about newspapers,

and whether those of us in the journalism profession have done a job of giving our readers all the information they need to make informed decisions.

It's my contention that we have not. And that contention was reinforced when I had lunch recently with a former teacher and principal, now retired, from the Farmington school district.

He said he shared my concern about the quality of newspaper reporting on a variety of topics, including teacher contracts.

"When I was a teacher, the paper used to report that teachers got a 10 percent increase because that's what the contract called for," he said. "But they totally missed the fact that we were receiving increments on top of the contractual agreement."

"So, when the paper said we teachers were getting 10 percent raises, I was getting raises as high as 20 and even 25 percent."

Hopefully, you knew all about increments before I asked the question at the top of this column. We have been trying to do a better job of covering these issues during the past few years.

But if you didn't, it means we're going to have to do even better in the future... to make certain you have complete and detailed information on which to base decisions.

Over the years, I like to believe that we have done a pretty good job. In fact, I think we have done far better than virtually any other newspaper in the state.

That does not mean, however, that we can't get better. And that's exactly what we're going to do.

- 6 tablespoons plain nonfat yogurt
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
- Granulated sugar substitute to equal 1 teaspoon sugar
- 1/2 cup egg substitute
- 4 slices reduced-calorie white bread
- 1 medium banana, sliced
- 1/2 cup reduced-calorie maple-flavored syrup

In small bowl, whisk together yogurt, vanilla, and sugar substitute. Set aside.

Pour egg substitute into shallow bowl; dip bread in egg substitute, coating both sides and absorbing all liquid.

Spray large nonstick skillet with nonstick cooking spray; over medium heat, cook bread until browned on both sides. Remove to heated platter, cover, and keep warm. In same skillet, quickly cook banana slices until golden on each side.

Place 2 slices bread on each serving plate;

FILL UP, CUT CALORIES Tofu makes the impossible possible

Mention tofu to anyone but the initiated, and the response is usually, "Ugh!"

But in Asia, tofu is a staple of the diet and a major source of protein. Until recently, tofu-eaters in the West fell into two camps: health-food fanatics and Asian immigrants.

But the bean curd's image is improving. It's widely available, and cooks are learning to use it in a variety of ways. Tofu may look like an unappetizing sponge floating in water, but its malleable texture and ability to absorb flavors of whatever it's cooked in make it one of the most versatile foods around.

The 2,500-year-old food now is common in many supermarkets. And almost all health-food stores and Asian markets carry it in some form.

Basically, tofu comes in two textures: soft and firm. Soft tofu can be used in place of sour cream or mayonnaise in soups, sauces, dips, puddings and creamy salad dressings. It's also good in place of yogurt in a smoothie.

Firm tofu has more body and less water content than soft, making it a good substitute for meat or eggs. It's ideal in a stir-fried dish, or crumbled in manicotti or lasagna dishes. Both textures are used in any number of ways, from main dishes to desserts.

Tofu also comes packaged in various ways. In an Asian market, you might find huge bricks of it floating in water, and you buy as much or as little as you need. More often you'll find it packaged in 1-pound water-filled tubs.

Now it's also sold in an aseptically packaged form that doesn't need to be refrigerated and has a shelf life of almost 10 months.

Tofu is made by soaking soybeans until they're soft before mashing them. Soy milk is extracted and mixed with natural coagulant that causes milk to curdle. The curds are then squeezed (to remove excess moisture), and the big white block that remains is tofu.

Pay attention to expiration dates whenever you purchase tofu. The fresher it is the better. Always store unused portions in fresh water in an airtight container in the refrigerator. Change the water daily. Though it will last about a week in the refrigerator, it's best to use it within three or four days.

Tofu can be used cooked or uncooked. People have been known to barbecue the stuff. One really easy way to enjoy it is to scramble it for breakfast with your favorite spices (or simply use Tofu Scrambler, a prepared mix of spices available in health-food stores).

For a filling, quick snack or meal, blend soft tofu into a shake. Try using 5 ounces of soft tofu, 1/2 cup soy milk, half a ripe banana, a teaspoon of carob powder and a teaspoon of honey.

Tofu isn't only for strict vegans, or those who must avoid milk products. It's ideal for any cook who is trying to cut down on the calories and saturated fats found in animal-based proteins. It is a complete source of protein (6 percent to 8 percent), and it's high in iron, calcium, phosphorus and vitamins E and B.

Tofu cookbooks have been around for years, but it used to be that you could only find them in health-food stores. Now it's going mainstream, turning up as an acceptable ingredient in many low-calorie dishes.

The California Culinary Academy's "Elegant Low-Calorie Cooking" has a number of recipes that feature tofu as an ingredient. Low-Cal Spinach Lasagna combines crumbled firm tofu with part-skim ricotta cheese to cut calories without sacrificing flavor. Consider making a double batch and freezing half to enjoy later. Tofu Teriyaki is a light saute of browned tofu and sweet and sour vegetables.

LOW-CALORIE SPINACH LASAGNA

Sauce

- 1/2 cup white wine
- 1 small onion, chopped finely
- 1/2 cup sliced mushrooms
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1/2 cup chopped carrots
- 1/2 cup chopped celery
- 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 3 cups plum tomatoes (canned or fresh), chopped
- 1 teaspoon dried basil
- 1/2 teaspoon dried oregano



Tofu is the secret ingredient in this tasty, low-calorie lasagna.

Lasagna

- 2 cups sliced onions
- 2 cups sliced mushrooms
- 1 cup white wine
- 2 cups chopped spinach leaves
- 1 tablespoon herbal salt substitute
- 1 cup crumbled firm tofu
- 1 cup farmer cheese or part-skim ricotta cheese
- Oil for greasing baking dish
- 1 (16-ounce) package spinach lasagna noodles, cooked and drained
- 2 tablespoons Parmesan cheese mixed with 1/4 cup breadcrumbs

To prepare Sauce, in medium saucepan heat wine; add onion, mushrooms, garlic, carrots and celery. Saute over medium-high heat for 15 minutes. Add nutmeg, tomatoes, basil and oregano. Cover and cook over medium heat for 30 minutes, stirring frequently.

Puree sauce in blender. Set aside.

While sauce is cooking, saute onions, and mushrooms in white wine over medium heat until soft (about 10 minutes). Add spinach leaves and salt substitute and cook, covered, for 1 minute.

Remove from heat and mix with tofu and farmer cheese. Set aside.

Preheat oven to 375 F. Lightly oil 9x12-inch baking

dish.

Assemble lasagna by layering spinach filling, sauce and noodles. Repeat twice, using all ingredients and ending with noodles on top.

Sprinkle lasagna with Parmesan-bread crumb mixture. Bake lasagna for 30 minutes.

Yields 6 to 8 servings.

Here's a great combination — sweet-and-sour vegetables and tofu — that you can prepare ahead of time and keep in a tightly covered container in the refrigerator for up to four days before serving.

TOFU TERIYAKI

- 1 tablespoon sesame oil
- 1 pound firm tofu, drained and cut into 1-inch cubes.
- 2 cups chopped vegetables (onion, red bell pepper, squash and broccoli, or whatever you have available)
- 2 tablespoons rice vinegar
- 1/2 cup low-sodium tamari OR soy sauce
- 3 tablespoons honey
- 1/2 cup sherry OR mirin (Japanese sweet rice wine)

In skillet or wok heat oil and lightly saute tofu until

Boston proves a dining tourist's delight

from New Bedford I was ready to head into the heart of the city and show Tom around. He had arrived a few hours earlier and was eager to get our one and only evening on the town in progress.

I consulted the handy, dandy subway map and routed us into the center of the activity. Although we'd planned on a bus

tour around the metropolis, it was too late, so we began to walk.

You must appreciate, Boston is no Detroit. I'm not sure how safe it is but I do know that it is certainly a tourist friendly city. Paths with arrows lead to all of the historic spots. Did you know that Mother Goose is buried in Boston? Well, she is. Along with many other at-one-time famous persons.

Without going into detail, Boston is decisively a history-oriented city. I'm just so-so on historical rhetoric so after several hours of looking at this and that it was time for serious business.

Hit the restaurants.

Our first stop was the Four Seasons Hotel, whose claim to fame is five stars. The only five star lodging in Boston, it is a visually impressive place with not a bit of warmth to it. Imagine being served a glass of wine by a waitress wearing a black cock-

tail dress. Not a uniform, but full-fledged, couldn't-you-die, evening apparel. Sorry, not when I'm in shorts because it's 90 degrees out.

This is okay for some, but a bit pretentious for us. The bar snack was even a bit snobby . . . colossal cashews warmed in a silver chafar and served in a \$100 silver nut dish. No, indubitably not a Brady hangout.

So, on to Biba's. Just a short jog down the street and we're in the bar of one of the country's foremost women chefs, Lydia Shire. She has become a foremost authority on the use of organ meats. A part of the menu is devoted to vital parts.

Now, this was more our speed: casual, warm and interesting. The restaurant itself is up a flight and I was fortunate enough to get a tour of the kitchen and meet the sous chef, also a woman. Tandori and wood burning ovens are the back

bones of the cooking equipment. Both are incredibly hot and the people working them had many, many burns up and down their arms to attest to the blazing infernos.

After a quick appetizer we were on our way to the "Cheers" bar. The line was short and we were seated at the now-famous tavern within a brief amount of time. I don't know why Norm spends so many hours on his stool . . . two T-shirts later and \$50 lighter I was ready to go.

The Parker House rolls beckoned. Although considered an antique by some, warm wood paneling, a graceful mahogany bar and comfortable stools were just what we needed. The best part of the evening was to happen here.

When asked what beverage I would like to partake of, I replied, "a nice class of red wine." The bartender recited the house pours, all pleasant, and lastly pulled a bottle that had been opened by accident. I

questioned as to what it was. A 1988 Opus One.

"I'm not sure it is any good, but you're welcome to give it a try."

I wasn't going to pass this up. It was a chance in a lifetime. As I took the first sip, I prayed that the wine would be all I'd heard it to be. It was. There was a glass and a half left. The first cost \$4.50, the half was free. You must appreciate that this is a \$100 bottle of wine. Guess who got a great tip!!!

Our final few hours were spent wandering the North End, which is predominantly Italian. It was after midnight when we hailed a cab and headed for the sheets. Tomorrow we'd drive to Provincetown and a wonderful visit with cousins that I hadn't seen in too many years.

browned. It may fall apart a little, which is fine. When browned, remove tofu to a platter and set it aside.

Add a little more sesame oil to skillet, if needed, and saute vegetables until tender.

In small saucepan heat rice vinegar, tamari or soy sauce, honey, and sherry or mirin until boiling. Reduce heat and simmer sauce for 5 minutes.

Add tofu to vegetable saute and pour sauce over all. Heat through and serve hot.

Yields 4 servings.

An excellent low-calorie substitute for ground beef, this crumbled tofu mixture is reminiscent of the sloppy joes that we all loved as children.

TOFU SLOPPY JOES ON WHEAT ROLLS

1 teaspoon safflower oil
2 tablespoons dry sherry
1 onion finely chopped
¼ cup minced green bell pepper
2 cloves garlic minced
¼ cup whole-wheat bread crumbs
2 cups firm tofu, drained and crumbled
1 teaspoon low-sodium tamari OR soy sauce
1 teaspoon nutritional yeast (yellow flakes)
Herbal salt substitute and freshly ground black pepper, to taste

2 cups tomato sauce
1 teaspoon cayenne pepper, or to taste
¼ teaspoon ground cumin
6 whole-wheat hamburger buns

In skillet, heat oil and sherry; saute onion over medium heat until soft but not browned.

Add bell pepper and garlic and cook until pepper is soft.

Add bread crumbs, tofu, tamari or soy sauce, yeast and salt substitute and pepper; mix well, cooking 3 minutes more to blend flavors.

Remove from heat and add tomato sauce, cayenne and cumin. Lightly toast insides of hamburger buns and fill with sloppy joe mixture.

These tofu cutlets are well seasoned with a spice mixture. Try them in sandwiches or as a light entree with a mushroom gravy or baked in a tomato-cheese sauce.

BAKED TOFU

1 pound firm tofu, drained
3 tablespoons whole-wheat flour
2 tablespoons nutritional yeast (yellow flakes)
1 tablespoon minced garlic
1 tablespoon onion powder
¼ teaspoon ground oregano
1 teaspoon poultry seasoning
1 teaspoon low-sodium tamari OR soy sauce
1 teaspoon dark sesame oil
Oil, for greasing pan

Preheat oven to 350 F. Slice tofu into 8 equal-size slabs. Place tofu on paper towel-lined baking sheet; cover with another single layer of paper towels and weight tofu with a phone book or large cutting board for 30 minutes.

In bowl, mix together flour, yeast, garlic, onion powder, oregano and poultry seasoning. In another bowl, combine tamari or soy sauce and sesame oil.

Lightly grease 9x12-inch baking sheet. Coat tofu pieces with tamari mixture, then with flour mixture, covering all surfaces.

Place on baking sheet and cook, turning once, until both sides are lightly browned (15 to 25 minutes).

Serve hot.

The trick with this soup is to attain a delicate balance between the savory stock, spicy pepper, sour vinegar and mushroom flavors.

HOT AND SOUR SOUP

8 cups of defatted Chicken Stock (recipe follows)

¼ cup dried black mushrooms (such as shiitake)

1 teaspoon sesame oil

1 tablespoon sake

¼ cup minced onion

8 ounces firm tofu, cubed

3 tablespoons arrowroot mixed with ¼ cup cold water

3½ tablespoons rice vinegar

1 beaten egg

3 tablespoons low sodium tamari OR soy sauce

¼ teaspoon cayenne pepper

¼ teaspoon freshly ground black pepper

In large stock pot, heat stock. Add dried mushrooms and simmer for 15 minutes. Strain out

mushrooms, leaving stock simmering on stove. Cut off and discard mushroom stems. Slice tops thinly and return to stock pot.

In small skillet, heat sesame oil and sake; add onion and saute slowly until onion is very soft. Add onion and any pan liquor to stock in stock pot.

Stir in: tofu, arrowroot mixture, vinegar, egg, tamari or soy sauce, cayenne and black pepper; cook until egg forms into ribbons and soup thickens slightly from arrowroot (about 1 minute). Serve hot.

CHICKEN STOCK

2 pounds chicken bones, back and neck water to cover
1 stalk celery
1 onion quartered
1 bay leaf
1 carrot

In large stock pot, combine chicken bones, back and neck, and water. Add celery, onion, bay leaf and carrot. Simmer over low heat 1½ hours. Strain.

NOTE: To remove fat, allow stock to chill for 2 hours. Fat will separate and rise to the top. Scoop fat off with spoon and discard. Remaining stock may be used in recipes calling for defatted chicken.

This low-calorie version of everyone's favorite blue cheese dressing is thickened to turn it into a dip.

BLUE CHEESE DIP WITH TOFU

8 ounces soft tofu, drained

3 tablespoons cider vinegar

¼ cup non-fat yogurt

1 teaspoon safflower oil

1 clove garlic, minced

¼ teaspoon white pepper

3 ounces blue cheese

Assorted raw vegetables, for accompaniment

Puree all ingredients except raw vegetables in blender or food processor. Pour into serving bowl and chill for several hours. Serve with raw vegetables.

¼ ounce shelled pecans, finely chopped

Fresh fruit and confectioners' sugar for garnish (optional)

Spray a nonstick waffle iron with nonstick cooking spray; heat according to manufacturer's directions.

In small bowl, combine oats, flour, sugar, baking powder and salt. In 1-cup measure, whisk together egg yolk, milk and pecans; stir into oat mixture until just combined (do not beat or over mix). Set aside.

In separate bowl, with electric mixer on high speed, beat egg white until stiff; fold into oat mixture.

Pour batter into preheated waffle iron. Close and bake on high or according to manufacturer's directions until golden brown, about 4 minutes. Makes 1 serving. Note: This recipe can be doubled and freezes well.

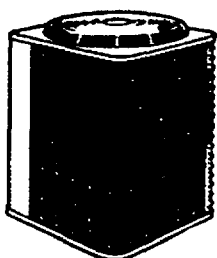

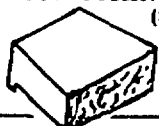

Don't need to head south for Key lime treat

If you travel to the southernmost point of the continental United States, you will surely happen upon a most heavenly dessert. And once you taste this tropical delight, you'll undoubtedly return to Michigan craving more.

Why is it that most of us have to travel to the Florida Keys to discover a treat that's been here all along? I can't answer that question, but after sampling a few slices of Key lime pie from three local experts, I can say, there's no need to travel. The Keys for Key lime pie.

When John and Frank Camilleri took over ownership of the Whistle Stop restaurant in Birmingham a few months ago, they didn't think Key lime pie would become one of their signature desserts. Whistle Stop provided the pie that was photographed in our Livonia studio for this story.

"Key lime pie was on the menu when we assumed ownership and has been on the menu for many years," said John Camilleri.

"Many of the recipes we're following were established by the restaurant's founder Kathryn Griffith, and we're dedicated to maintaining the integrity she established, and the collection of her original recipes."

It's hard to say what the original Key lime pie recipe looked like when Floridians discovered the Key lime. If you travel throughout the Keys to-day, you'll encounter pies made mostly with a graham cracker crust, and a few made with a butter pastry crust.

Most recipes for the filling incorporate sweetened condensed milk, egg yolks or whole eggs, and lime juice. Some fillings are baked, others are thickened with gelatin and refrigerated. Some are topped with meringue, most are garnished with whipped cream.

At the Whistle Stop, John Camilleri

improvised the traditional graham cracker crust a bit by adding chopped pecans and walnuts. The nuts add a nice crunch to the crust texture, and also balance well with the tangy Key lime filling.

I guess you should really expect a restaurant named Key Largo to feature Key lime pie on its menu, and you're right. Not only is it on the menu, it's been the best-selling dessert since the Walled Lake restaurant opened in 1987.

The technique used for the Key Largo pie filling is very similar to many found in the Keys. The filling—whole eggs, lime juice and sweetened condensed milk—is thickened with natural gelatin. It's then poured into a baked graham cracker crust and refrigerated 4-6 hours before serving.

According to Chef Matthew Jaguch, the secret to Key Largo's success starts with the use of authentic Key West lime juice which is ordered in gallon containers from Key West.

"Not only do we use the lime juice in our pie filling, but we also use it in a number of our tropical seafood entrees and salsas," he said.

Chefs at Whistle Stop and Key Largo agree that Nellie and Joe's Key West lime juice makes all the difference in their Key lime pies.

If you read Key lime juice bottle labels carefully, you'll notice a variety of descriptions for what's inside the bottle. Nellie and Joe's product is labeled, Key West Lime juice. Others call their product Key lime juice. If you travel to that southernmost part of Florida, you'll have difficulty finding an authentic Key lime tree.

And if you go to a produce market such as the Waterfront Market on Williams Street in Key West, they'll tell you that key limes are available only at certain times of the year. If you inquire further, they'll explain that it all depends on when an elderly

Tart desserts Keys' best-kept secret

KEY LARGO'S KEY LIME PIE

2 large eggs, separate yolks and whites
16 ounces condensed milk
2 ounces Key lime juice
1/2 ounce natural gelatin
1/2 ounce very hot water
1 9-inch graham cracker pie shell

Add yolks to mixer bowl. Using the whites, brush them lightly over the graham cracker crust shell. Bake crust in a 350 degree oven for 2 minutes or until golden brown. Set crust aside to cool while preparing the filling.

Whip the yolks until they are light and lemon in color. In a separate bowl, dissolve gelatin in the hot water. When dissolved very slowly add to mixing bowl. Then, slowly add condensed milk. Stir well blending in lime juice. Pour filling into cooled crust

and refrigerate for 4-6 hours. Serve chilled garnished with whipped cream and thin fresh lime slices.

KEY WEST LIMEADE

1 cup Key West lime juice
1 cup sugar
1 cup water
Club soda

Prepare a sugar syrup by mixing the sugar and water in a saucepan until dissolved. Remove from heat and pour in lime juice. Refrigerate mixture. To serve use 1 part lime syrup to 6 parts cold club soda.

KEY LIME PIE

1 9-inch graham cracker pie crust
1 14-ounce can sweetened condensed milk

8 ounces non-dairy topping (Cool Whip)
1/2 cup fresh lime juice
1/4 cup fresh lemon juice

Mix condensed milk with non-dairy topping until blended. Add lime juice and lemon juice to mixture and blend well. Pour into graham cracker crust. Refrigerate 3 hours before serving. Top with whipped cream (optional).

NORMAN VAN AKE'S KEY LIME SNOW

2 envelopes Knox unflavored Gelatine
1/2 cup cold water
1/4 cup sugar

1/4 teaspoon grated Key lime or lime peel
1/2 cup Key lime or lime juice
1 1/2 cups boiling water
4 egg whites

In a large bowl, sprinkle unflavored gelatine over cold water; let stand 5 minutes. Stir in sugar until blended. Add boiling water; stir until gelatine is completely dissolved, about 3 minutes. Add lime peel and juice. Chill until slightly thickened, about 15 minutes.

In a medium bowl, beat egg whites until stiff. While beating, gradually add gelatine mixture; beat until soft peaks form. Spoon into 8 dessert cups or a serving bowl; chill until firm about 2 hours.

Garnish, if desired, with twisted lime peel. Makes about 8 servings.

Cuban man named Joe (we think he's the same Joe as the founder of Nellie and Joe's) delivers them in a small basket.

According to Rod Millar, present owner of Nellie and Joe's, there has not been a commercial production of lime juice made exclusively with Key limes since 1946.

The Key lime trees which grow in Florida are very limited in number, "mostly because they're difficult to grow," he said. They grow on a small fragile tree which is easily injured by the winds and needs to be in a well-drained location.

Nellie and Joe's Key West lime juice is a blend of limes grown in southern Florida. What makes their product different is in the percentage of acidity formulated or blended to resemble the flavor of an authentic Key lime.

Before you pass judgment on the Key Lime pies in Birmingham and Walled Lake, you should venture to Southfield and try the pie at the Baker's Loaf on Northwestern Highway.

Here you'll find yet another version made with a graham cracker crust and a filling of sweetened condensed

milk, Rose's lime juice and egg yolks which is baked and then topped with meringue. This popular pie is made year-round.

Owners Duane and Paula Christ have been making Key lime pie since they first opened their shop in 1977 according to shop/restaurant vice president Chuck Christ. "They've always been a good seller," he said "but it's incredible how the interest in this dessert continues to grow." So, if you've been looking for authentic Key limes to make a pie you should give up your search. But, when you're in

the Florida Keys, look for Joe carrying a basket filled with limes that are a greenish-yellow in color and have a thin rind.

Now, if you want to take the easy way out, buy a bottle of Key West lime juice found at most gourmet shops including the Merchant of Vino in Birmingham, Southfield, and Troy, and in the Marketplace at Hudson's. Most bottled lime juice has a shelf life of 6-8 months.

According to Rod Millar, Nellie and Joe's lime juice can be stored in the refrigerator 1 to 2 years.

Pasta approach has unique taste

Discover one of the age-old culinary secrets of the Italians. For centuries, they have been tossing hot pasta with no-cook sauces of chopped raw ingredients, olive oil, herbs and seasonings.

Salt and freshly ground black pepper

Combine the tomatoes, basil, onion, garlic. Stir in the ricotta, olive oil, salt and pepper to taste. Toss hot pasta with the sauce and serve at once.

Yield — 3 cups, or enough for 1 pound pasta, such as rotelle, fusilli, ziti, penne or tubetti.

Another no-cook pasta sauce is the following variation of the proverbial favorite, pesto. This sauce freezes well if the cheese is left out, then added once the sauce has thawed and is ready to use.

WALNUT PESTO SAUCE

1/2 cup broken walnuts
1 large clove garlic, chopped

2 cups packed fresh basil leaves
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 cup packed Italian flat leaf parsley
1/2 cup olive oil
1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese

Finely chop walnuts and garlic in a food processor; add half the basil and salt; coarsely chop. Add remaining basil and parsley.

With the processor running, add oil in a slow steady stream through the feed tube until mixture is thoroughly blended.

Transfer to a bowl; fold in cheese. Remove 1/4 cup of the pasta cooking liquid before draining the pasta. Toss hot pasta with sauce and reserved cooking liquid. Serve at once with additional cheese, if desired.

Yield — 1 1/2 cups, or enough for 1 1/2 pounds pasta

Letterman rebounds from a wintry year of discontent

"Don't forget this," says an unusually sincere David Letterman. "I know I'm the luckiest man on the planet." It's a side of the wisecracking talk-show host that many viewers noticed virtually for the first time during his farewell speech on the last "Late Night With David Letterman," Friday, June 25, on NBC.

Preparing to launch a new series, "Late Show With David Letterman" on CBS, Letterman, who held out for months for an earlier time slot and will now earn \$14 million a year, is lucky," he says, to be employed. When NBC named Jay Leno to replace Johnny Carson as host of "The Tonight Show," Letterman found himself at a turning point.

"At that point," he says, "honest to God, I thought that I was just going to have to leave and wouldn't have a job. And I'm very, very lucky to be in this situation.

"I always wanted to be considered as a candidate to have the job (as 'Tonight Show' host). And that never happened. So obviously that was disappointing to me.

"Now, as I guess time does for

you, it kind of leads me to believe that things worked out for the better. Through all of this, I've suffered no rancor. I've had a little remorse."

As for his new, five-day work week, Letterman observes, "Don't most Americans work five days? It's going to be a back-breaker, I know."

And what about that salary? Won't it put him at arm's length from his audience?

"Geez...I hope not," he replies. "I'm certainly not worth that kind of dough...It happens to be the marketplace." Unable to resist a straight line, he adds, "If that happens, I'll just, you know, buy a new audience!"

On the subject of guests, Letterman's top-10 list begins with Johnny Carson, who has not appeared on any talk show since his retirement from the genre in May 1992.

"I would love to have Johnny Carson on our show under any circumstances," he says. "That would be great for me. I kind of get almost embarrassed when I talk about Carson, because he meant so much to me in my life and my career.

"The first time I was on ('The Tonight Show'), it was like, you pull a \$5 bill out of your pocket and the next thing you know, you see Abe Lincoln walking down the street. It was like, 'Oh, my god, it's Johnny Carson.' And it never stopped feeling that way."

Letterman admits he's sorry to be leaving Rockefeller Center behind in the move from NBC to CBS.

"It's easily one of the great, recognizable landmarks on the globe," he says. "It was exciting, it was convenient, it was glamorous. Everything about it was absolutely wonderful. And we're leaving that behind. But I think that we will be able to find a home for ourselves."

The new home for Letterman and his staff is CBS' Ed Sullivan Theater, which is being renovated for his use.

"I've been in there three or four times, and every time I go in there, I stay about eight minutes, and then all you see are big clouds of asbestos. And then I have to get out. I just think it might have been easier to renovate Ed Sullivan than the theater itself," he concludes, returning to his on-air form.

The biggest question, for both fans and lawyers, concerns the contract of the new Letterman show. A saber-rattling NBC has already laid claim to certain "intellectual property." Letterman's producers have conceded that character names (like Larry "Bud" Melman) and the billing for music director Paul Shaffer's World's Most Dangerous Band belong to NBC. The Top-10 Lists and Stupid Pet/Human Tricks are Letterman property, however.

All in all, Letterman, Shaffer and crew think of it as the same show, only earlier.

"I think all these questions will be answered, like, the first night or the first week," Letterman says. "I mean, it'll either seem very odd to see me an hour earlier, or it'll seem okay.

"You know, I see myself almost every hour of the day, and I think that's fine."

Beloved 'Loving'
actor dies

Bernard Barrow, who played Louie Slavinsky on ABC's "Loving," died of lung cancer on Wednesday, Aug. 4, in New York City's Lenox Hill hospital.

Executive producer Haidee Granger says, "Bernie's death has come as a shock to his friends and colleagues at 'Loving.' Bernie brought a zest and joie de vivre to his role and to our studio. Because of his kindness and support, he made the task of creating a daily show a true pleasure. Bernie was much loved and respected and will be greatly missed."

The actor was well-loved by fans, who enjoyed his charming, affable portrayals. Barrow's characters were famous for doling out good advice and always helping those in need — much like the actor himself.

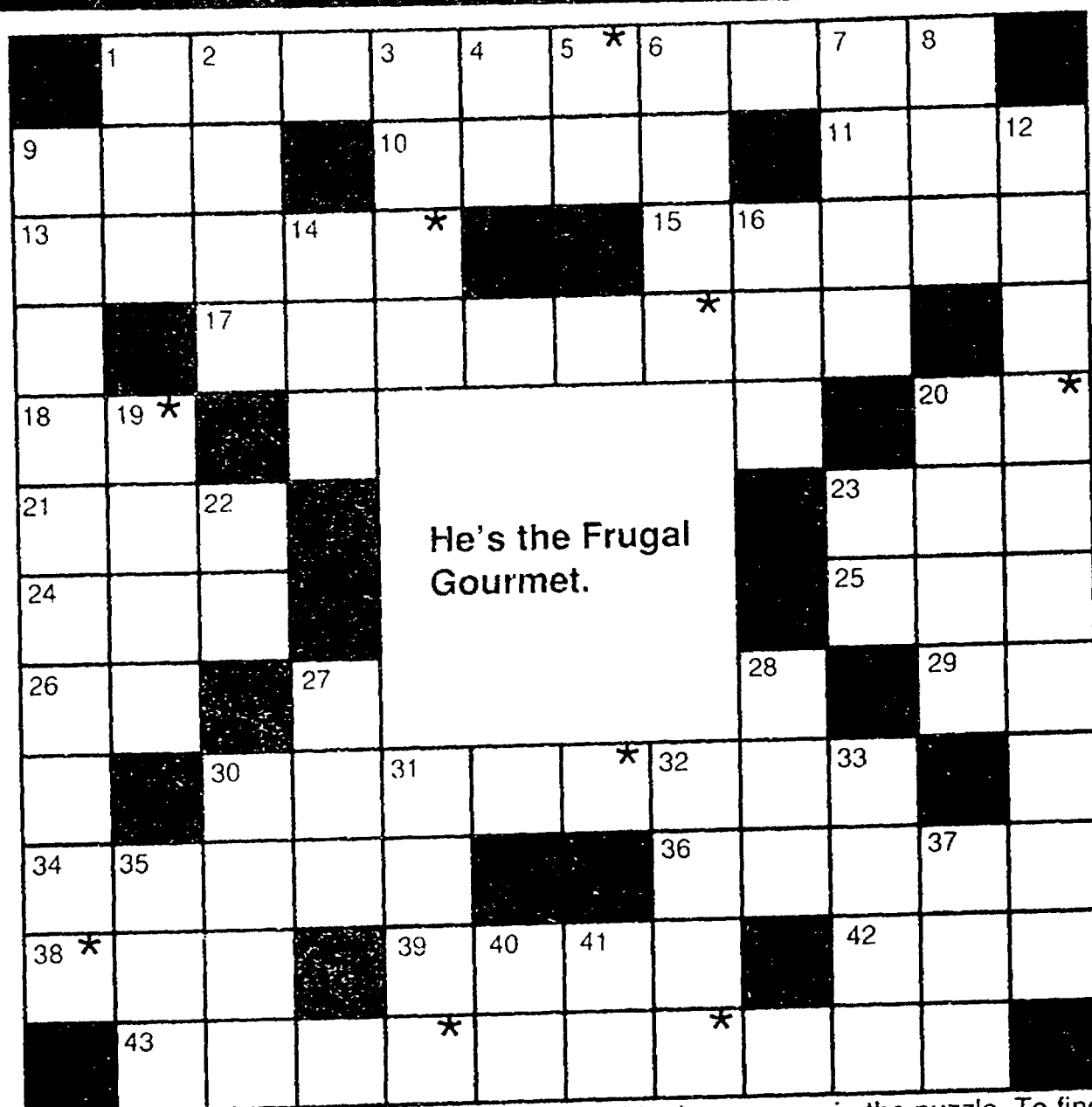
Barrow received the Emmy Award as Best Supporting Actor for his portrayal of Louie in 1991. He was nominated for two additional Emmys in the leading actor category for his work as Johnny Ryan on ABC's multiaward-winning daytime drama "Ryan's Hope." His other television credits include "The Edge of Night," "The Secret Storm," "Law & Order" and "The Waltons."

The veteran performer, born Dec. 30, 1927, began his professional career as a child radio actor in the 1940s. He graduated to the theater, appearing in musical and dramatic regional productions, and then went on to perform in motion pictures. His films include "Serpico," "Rachel, Rachel," "Glass Houses," "Claudine" and "The Survivors."

Barrow earned his doctorate in theater history from Yale University and was on the faculty of Brooklyn College from 1955 until his retirement from academia in 1983 as Professor Emeritus. Many of his students, including Jimmy Smits, have gone on to distinguished careers.

A native New Yorker, Barrow was raised in Manhattan's Yorkville section. He is survived by his wife, actress Joan Kaye of Manhattan; his children, Susan Barrow and Thomas E.L. Barrow; and stepchildren, Dr. Richard Katz and Sue Ann Cates.
