

School board, teachers ink two-year contract

Although the 1994-95 step scale for Northville teachers' wages could climb by 3 percent, some teachers in the Northville Public School District could see wage increases of almost 9 percent. Others, however, will get nothing additional in their pay checks for the 1993-94 school year.

Board of education members approved the two year pact with Northville Education Association members at a special meeting held last Wednesday. The teachers ratified the contract Sept. 2.

A teacher with a master's degree going from step one to step two (steps are measured by years of experience) on the wage scale will enjoy the highest increase at 8.7 percent this school year, while the lowest raise on the step scale would be 4.4 percent for a teacher with a bachelor's degree going from Step 10 to Step 11.

Those teachers not on the step scale, which accounts for over 70 percent of the Northville employment force, won't see any increases in their salaries over the 1992-93 school year. Those same teachers will see a 3 percent wage increase in the second year of the contract, though.

In the 1994-95 school year, teachers on the step scale will see wage increases ranging from 98 percent to 8.7 percent. A teacher with a bachelor's or master's degree plus 20 credits of semester work going from a base salary to step one would receive the .98 percent increase while an educator with a master's degree going from step one to step two would get the 8.7 percent extra in wages.

The introduction of the base wage scale begins in the 1994-95 school year, which creates 12 steps instead of 11. In essence, step one, which pays \$28,242 this year, will become the base step for the 1994-95 school

year. Those who are classified as step one through step 2.5 employees in the 1994-95 school year will see a 1 percent increase in their salaries while teachers on the step three through step 11 levels will receive a 3 percent raise.

The wage step scale for teachers employed with one of the district's center programs, Bryant Center or Old Village School, is based on the same principles as those of teachers on the 187 day schedule. Center program teachers work for 232 days, therefore, receive a higher base wage of \$33,077.

The center program teacher's step scale will also climb from 1 to 3 percent in the

1994-95 school year.

There are about 50 center program educators and over 200 teachers represented by the Northville Education Association. Under the contract, the least amount a 187-day teacher with a bachelor's degree could make is \$28,242. The most he or she could make while still on the step scale is \$59,403 plus \$1,200 for completing a doctoral program.

A center program teacher with a bachelor's degree starts at \$33,077. One with a doctorate at the top of the step scale can earn up to \$69,404 plus \$1,200 in extra credit pay.

Township teen gets job as D.C. page

High school junior Lindsay Petrie has gone back to school like everyone else her age, but the 16-year-old's classrooms are more than a few miles from her Northville Township home.

The teen has been awarded a congressional pageship and has left for the Washington, D.C., area where she'll live and work for the next three months.

Lindsay was recommended for the position by Congressman William Ford, D-Ypsilanti.

"She's very good in school," Ford said of his protegee. "We're bringing her down for the fall semester, which we never do unless we have a student whose counselor tells us

they're the kind of student that can be away for that long in that very essential stage in their high school education, and not suffer from it."

Lindsay met Ford during the veteran politician's campaign for Congress last year. She got a chance to speak with him in person when her father, Jim, a local Democratic activist, volunteered to work on the representative's re-election campaign and sponsored a reception for him.

"I was talking to him and he urged me to apply," Lindsay said. "I'm really interested in seeing how the government works firsthand."

As a page, Lindsay will live in a special dorm near the capital and attend school during the morning hours. In the afternoons, she'll report to the House of Representa-

tives where she'll be put to work shuttling messages and packages back and forth among Democratic members of the lower chamber.

To earn recommendation for pageships, students must have at least a 3.0 grade point average and must be active in school and in their communities.

Lindsay was a member of the Student Congress while a freshman at Northville High School and was sophomore class president last year. She also worked on the yearbook staff, and on the homecoming parade.

In terms of community activities, Lindsay has counseled fellow diabetics at a summer camp, and volunteered for the annual Victor-

Teens brainstorm about youth center

Northville teens, at least the several who stopped by last Wednesday's task force meeting on a new youth center, just want a place to call their own.

Board pleased with pact

With few criticisms from audience members, the Northville Board of Education seemed quite happy with this year's contract settlement with the Northville Education Association.

The board approved the 2-year contract at a special meeting held last Wednesday.

"I am very pleased at what efforts were put together by both negotiating teams," Superintendent Leonard Reznierski said. "Both sides were concerned about where we were going with funds."

A few residents in attendance at the meeting did raise questions regarding the salary increases and benefit packages. However, several suggested the board wait to ratify the contract.

"To ratify an agreement that the taxpayers have not seen or read about is not really good publicity," said John Quinn, a 15-year resident of Northville. "It's almost like the Detroit Tigers firing Ernie Harwell. Give the public a chance to understand what has been brought to the board to ratify."

Reznierski said he didn't know how the district and teachers could prove they were good stewards of the taxpayer's funds other than to "come down 5.8 percent to 0." The wage in-

Twp. merges police and fire

In a surprise move Thursday night, Northville Township Trustees voted 4-3 to merge the fire and police departments into one public safety unit and name the police chief the director of the new department.

It was Treasurer Rick Engelland who voted to stray from the agenda and made the motion to approve the consolidation proposal which surfaced from the township administration last month. Engelland's motion overruled the trustees' plan to establish a committee to review the proposal that night.

"It's a good proposal," Engelland said. "I'm in favor of it. It's a small administrative thing and if the manager and the supervisor think it's good, then I think we should support it."

Township Police Chief Chip Snider was not present at the meeting when the plan was adopted, but Fire Chief Rick Rosselle was. Snider said Fri-

day morning he was surprised but pleased with the board's decision. Rosselle was visibly upset by the board's vote Thursday night.

"I didn't attend the meeting because there was nothing of mine on the agenda," Snider said. "I'm surprised that they took action as rapidly as they did."

Rosselle left the meeting Thursday mumbling in disgust at the board's decision.

"They sold out the fire department and didn't even ask us what we thought about it," he said in the hallway outside the board meeting room.

Snider accepted the position weeks ago when the concept was presented to him by Manager Bill Richards and Supervisor Karen Baja, even though the board didn't connect a salary improvement to the additional responsibilities.

"I welcome the opportunity and challenge of trying to blend the philosophies of the fire chief and myself into the formation of a public safety

department," he said.

The consolidation plan was co-authored by Richards and Baja. It was brought to trustees for their approval on Aug. 12, but a decision on it was delayed until trustees studied informally a week later and sought to form a committee to determine its feasibility.

That committee was expected to be formed Thursday night, but the proposal passed, with minor changes suggested by Engelland.

Under the initial plan presented by Richards, Snider would oversee the combined police and fire forces as the public safety director. Originally, Richards and Baja had asked that the chief receive a \$6,500 salary increase to do the job. But the raise was omitted from the plan as was the idea of bumping Fire Chief Rick Rosselle's title from chief to captain.

The treasurer's motion Thursday sought won support without addi-

crease in the last year of the previous three-year pact was 5.8 percent.

"I don't know how much farther down we can go," he added.

Board president Robert McMahon said he felt it was the board's responsibility to respond immediately to the Northville Education Association.

"The issue of ratification is different than getting the word out that we did a good thing," Reznierski said after another resident urged the board to wait and let the public review the contract before board

ratification.

Jerry Rupley, vice-president for Advocates for Quality Education, told members he felt the district did a fine job with negotiations.

"Personally, I would urge you to support the contract," he said.

As chairperson of the Advocates' collective bargaining sub-committee, Rupley said he was pleased the board and association recognized some of the issues the interest group had suggested.

"The salary was reasonable, appropriate restraint was shown," Rupley said. "It looks like progress was

made in controlling benefit costs."

Rupley added that the accountability issue recommended by Advocates appeared as if it was addressed in the contract with an emphasis on evaluations designed to enhance performance.

He was also pleased with the committee given to the district's strategic plan and the fact that teachers were recognized for the work they perform beyond their professional day.

McMahon praised the district's negotiating team of director of personnel R. Roy Danley; assistant

superintendent for administrative services David Bolitho; and director of business and finance John Street for representing the district.

"I think we have a settlement that benefits both parties," he said. "If you compare the relationship with associations and other districts, you'll find confrontation and distrust. . . . What we have here is cooperation, respect and trust. . . . we're going to be faced with some difficult times ahead. This is not the beginning or end, but the continuation of a very solid relationship."

"As we face the uncertainty of next

year, if we stay united and unified, we're certainly on our way toward the winning end," vice-president Jean Hansen said, referring to Senate Bill 1, which will eliminate property taxes from funding public education.

School board secretary Glenna Davis said she hoped that as Michigan schools face change next year, Northville will come out one of the stronger districts.

Formal negotiations began May 13 between district representatives and NEA members, whose contract expired Aug. 31. Over 119 hours of for-

mal bargaining were held in 19 negotiation sessions. Danley said that while the association was a worthy advocate for its members, the two sides avoided being disagreeable.

"I think they apparently show their commitment to the Northville Public Schools not just as employees, but as a place to live, raise their families and make their careers," Danley said.

The board voted 6-0 to approve the contract. Trustee Joseph Dunkerley abstained. He had excused himself from the executive sessions in which negotiations were discussed because his wife is a teacher for the district

Township refuse hauler offers composting plan

out the proposed agreement he and his company pitched to them for a new composting facility.

Particulars of a proposed agreement have been and are still being discussed behind closed doors with township and BFI officials.

Line said Thursday night the two sides have reached a preliminary, tentative pact.

"I think it is still kind of preliminary to discuss it," Line said as he leafed through the proposed agreement trustees were asked to eyeball.

The proposal contains provisions granting BFI permission to build an 80-acre composting facility on the corner of Six Mile and Napier Roads in exchange for free composting services for Northville residents.

Under the tentative pact, BFI would provide composting services to township residents free of charge throughout the lifespan of the facility.

In exchange for being a host community to the composting operation, the township would receive three

percent of the gross revenues generated from the operation itself and 20 percent of the sales from the bagged fertilizer that would be produced at the site.

The facility would be screened and isolated with berms, and the composting would be done in phases to control odor. Runoff water from the facility would be collected and controlled and a clay and stone pad underneath the facility will be installed to avoid groundwater contamination, Line said.

Truck traffic would be restricted to entrances and exits to the facility on Napier Road.

The preliminary pact also includes an earlier BFI promise that if the company is awarded the rights to build, it would agree not to expand its Salem Township landfill operation into Northville Township. And if need be, BFI will purchase additional water and sewer capacity in the township trustees under the market rates.

The trustees didn't vote on the proposal Thursday and offered no indication when and if that vote will come before them. They are invited to

tour BFI's composting facility on Saturday, Sept. 18, at 9 a.m. Line hopes that a trip to the site would trigger a yes vote from the board.


"We own this property and it is right across the street from our landfill," he said. "It makes more sense to

do it here. We like to get it done."

Line said he offered surrounding communities the same opportunity he offered Northville Township. He did say that elected officials in Canton and Salem townships were interested in becoming a host community, but that the company preferred deal-

ing with Northville Township because of its proximity to its Arbor Hills facility.

Trustees had little reaction to the proposal. Gini Britton asked Line for an estimate of the how much revenue the township could net as the host

Fire workers pull trapped animal from utility ditch

It isn't easy being a Northville Township firefighter and risking your life to protect others.

It may not be easy, but it can be rewarding.

Township Fire Chief Ricke Rosselle was the first to respond to a Northville Township resident's desperate cry for help in the early morning of Sept. 4.

After Virginia Miller had no luck getting help from her 9-1-1 call to township police, she called the fire department at 6:45 a.m. and asked them to help her rescue her 12½ year old Collie from the 4-foot-deep hole he had fallen into at her Napier Road home.

Rosselle got a call at home Friday morning and drove right to the scene.

"When he fell in the dirt, the dirt followed him in and buried his right rear leg and tail," Rosselle said. "The left leg and tail were twisted around him."

"He couldn't lift himself out," he said.

The chief said the dog fell into a trench that had been dug to lay an underground water line to a neighbor's barn.

Debbie Brown is Miller's cousin and part-owner of the dog named

Brandy. Brown said she let Brandy and another dog out into the yard earlier that morning before she left for work.

Miller went out in the backyard to feed the horses when she heard the dog's cry for help. Thinking it was the neighbor's dog she was caring for, Brown went next door to check on the neighbor's hound.

But before she got there, she heard the cries coming from an area behind the neighbor's home. She found the dog in the hole and immediately began digging to get him out. After 45 minutes, Brown and Miller weren't having any luck and they called for help.

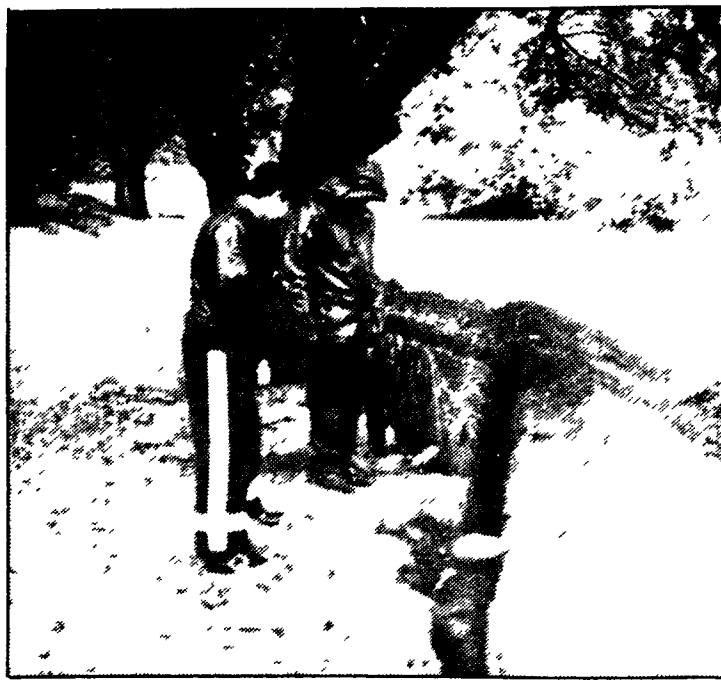
"He was wedged way down in the hole, his legs and his hips were buried," Brown said. "He was in real dire need and we were just two ladies here trying to dig him out."

The chief said it took at least two hours in the pouring rain for firefighters to free the dog from the hole.

"He was soaking wet and covered with sand," Rosselle said. "He was scared, shaken a little bit, but a very cooperative and a real nice dog."

Brown said she was shaken when Brandy couldn't stand on his own four feet after firefighters retrieved him.

"He couldn't stand on his own and they (firefighters) had to carry him,"

Brown said "The dog was really weak. He had pulled and strained muscles," Brown said her veterinarian told her after the dog was rescued.

Now, more than a week later, Brown said Brandy has recovered nicely without any visible injuries. She said the vet has warned her that the dog may develop pneumonia because of the length of time he spent in the damp, cold hole, but she has yet to see any signs of that.

Brown said she is thankful for the

firefighters' help and she attributes the dog's health and welfare to the department's quick response.

"They did an excellent job by the time they got here," Brown said. "They just got right in and had to jump in sideways because the hole was so narrow. They just did an excellent job. At the time we were so upset and too nervous to thank them after they got Brandy out. So I really want to thank them all for helping us and for caring for animals in this area."

Group to address harassment in schools

The American Association of University Women (AAUW) Northville-Nov branch will address a disturbing trend tomorrow evening at its annual new member autumn buffet.

Deborah Orlowski, an affirmative action representative from the University of Michigan, will speak on the topic of sexual harassment in the schools.

Orlowski will speak at 8 p.m. following a 6:30 p.m. buffet dinner at Northville First United Methodist Church on Eight Mile at Taft. Reservations for the buffet can still be made by calling membership vice-president Karen Olson at 347-4299.

According to an AAUW-commissioned survey in June, sex-

ual harassment has reached "epidemic proportions" in America's schools. *Hostile Hallways: The AAUW Survey on Sexual Harassment in America's Schools*, the first national scientific survey on the subject, found that 81 percent of students in grades 8 through 11 have been sexually harassed while at school.

"America's schools are filled with hostile hallways where daily, students are targets of sexual harassment," said AAUW Educational Foundation President Alice McKee. "Our children are learning at a very early age that sexual harassment is an everyday part of life, and we are

failing to teach them otherwise."

The survey, which was performed by Louis Harris and Associates, surveyed over 1,600 public school students about school-based sexual harassment. The survey found that girls and boys are experiencing sexual harassment at school ranging from unwanted sexual comments and gestures to having their clothes pulled off to being forced to do something sexual.

While the survey finds that both boys and girls are being sexually harassed at school, the AAUW survey points to a more detrimental effect on girls: 33 percent of the girls surveyed felt a diminished desire to attend

school as a result of the harassment they experienced compared to 12 percent of the boys; 43 percent of the girls who were harassed felt self-conscious whereas only one in five boys responded that way.

Members of the Northville-Nov branch of AAUW promote equity and education for women and girls through grassroots education, fundraising and political action.

The AAUW commissioned the sexual harassment study in response to its 1992 study titled *The AAUW Report: How Schools Shortchange Girls*, which examined gender inequities in American classrooms and revealed rising incidents of sexual harassment in schools.

Police to take part in charity fund-raiser

Northville Township Police will be trading in their combat boots for running shoes on Sept. 24, helping to bring home the torch for the Special Olympics.

ian Festival.

She said her favorite subject is social studies, and she plans to major in either pre-law or education in college.

Jim Petrie said, since being re-elected last year, Ford has been trying to reach out to portions of his district that are traditional Republican strongholds.

"Congressman Ford has been trying to get pages from areas that haven't historically had pages, like Northville and Ann Arbor."

Ford has served in the Congress for 28 years, but just started representing the Northville community

when his congressional district was redrawn to reflect 1990 census changes.

Jim Petrie said he worked hard to prepare Lindsay for her experience in Washington, discussing current issues with her and shopping for the uniform clothes she'll be required to wear at work.

He added that he feels confident she'll be safe in her new, fast-paced environment.

"We've got friends in the area, and they've got two people on guard 24 hours a day in the (dorm) building."

A page scandal rocked Capitol Hill during the 1980s when two Congressmen were discovered taking ad-

vantage of the underage workers. Since then, Jim said, important reforms have been made.

"They've tightened up dramatically. The pages used to stay for all four years of their schooling. They weren't regulated or carefully monitored."

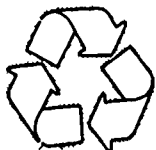

Guardians say mother kidnapped her children

A Northville couple reported their grandchildren missing after their daughter who lost legal guardianship to her parents didn't return the two children home last week.

The grandparents of the 10 and eight year old children reported that their 29 year-old daughter, a Canton Township resident, failed to comply with terms of the court by not bringing the children home from school on Sept. 6.

The daughter called her parents on Thursday to tell them she wasn't going to ever bring her children back to their house. The parents informed their attorney who advised them to notify police of the incident. The couple followed their attorney's advice, but didn't want police to do anything else with their complaint.

STALKER: A Northville woman told police she thinks she is being stalked by two white men in their 20's. The woman said the men have appeared to her on two occasions in the same dark blue four-door car.

The latest incident occurred on Tuesday, Sept. 7, at the Alexsi National building on Seven Mile Road. There the woman said she and her brother were near a dumpster on the side of the building when the car with the two suspects approached and threw on the car's headlights. The men flashed the lights on the woman's brother for a minute before they sped off.

She said a similar incident happened on Sept. 1 when she and her daughters were unloading trash from

a van into a nearby dumpster. She said the same car approached her. She told police she jumped into the van but not before one of the two grabbed the door and fell off.

ASSAULT AT STATE HOSPITAL: State Police troopers took a report of an assault at the Northville Regional Hospital on Sept. 2. An altercation occurred between two patients in the cafeteria. Police reports indicate that one patient bumped another, and some name-calling followed. One of the men then punched the other. The victim has declined to press charges, however, and police have closed the case.

WALKAWAY: A walkaway from Northville Regional Hospital was reported by the State Police. The pa-

tient, a 31-year old Detroit man, disappeared on Sept. 5, but returned to the hospital on his own on Sept. 7.

BICYCLE STOLEN: A 20 inch boy's bicycle was reported stolen from a Dunlap Street garage sometime between 4:05 p.m. Sept. 6 and noon Sept. 7. The \$180 bike was described as a red Dyno VFR GT. The garage door was partially open at the time of the theft.

CAR PARTS STOLEN: Four chrome valve stems valued at \$16 were reported stolen from a 1986 Corvette parked in the upper level of the city parking deck off Mary Alexander Court. State Police agree to turn over reports

The Michigan State Police has presented this paper with a number of activity reports in compliance with requests under Michigan's Freedom of Information Act. The post has also appointed an officer to act as a media liaison.

The reports, dated June 18 through Aug. 25, had been requested in an effort to report regularly on the activity at the Northville post of the State Police. Though the requests clearly stated that a reporter only wanted to view the reports, the State Police Central Records Division in Lansing billed the paper on four different occasions for obtaining and copying of the documents. The reports were not included with the invoices, and HomeTown Newspapers, parent company of this paper, sent no money.

Since June of this year, Freedom of Information requests had been filed every Thursday at Post 21. In all, 244 complaint reports were requested.

Michigan's FOI Act requires all public bodies, such as the state police, to release public documents on request. The Act identifies police reports as public documents, with some exceptions.

An apologetic Marie Pifer, director of the State Police Central Records Division in Lansing, called the paper last Thursday to announce that the requested reports would arrive at the post that day, and that all costs would be waived.

She indicated that costs were being waived because of the lateness with which the State Police responded to the paper's requests. Reports from June and July were billed on July 27 in the amount of \$201. Two bills arrived on Aug. 24 in the amounts of \$108 and \$29. A fourth bill arrived on Sept. 1 in the amount of \$49.

Though it could not be ascertained by presstime just how many reports had been supplied, a preliminary review indicated that the majority of the requests had been satisfied.

In addition, the Northville post has appointed Trooper Norm Harrington to act as media liaison in an effort to provide report information to the media more efficiently.

Northville Record Managing Editor

Michael Malott said he was pleased with the release of the records.

"We don't want to fight with the state police," Malott said. "At the same time, it seems very clear to us that police reports written by the State Police are public records under the FOI and we think it's important that a law enforcement agency follow the law."

"Not all the details are ironed out yet, but this is very positive. It appears we will be able to get regular access to those reports. And of course that means we'll be able to keep our readers better informed about criminal activity in the area and response to it by the State Police. I think the state police deserve credit for their openness, despite what appears to have been an initial misunderstanding."

Included in the package received Friday were reports of the following area incidents:

- A motorcyclist who was hit by a .50 caliber lead projectile, possibly fired from a slingshot, while driving along I-96 near Wixom Road on July 16.

Consolidation plan can help efficiency

Northville Township Trustees voted, 4-3, Thursday to effect a limited merger of the township's police and fire departments. Under the plan, developed by Manager Bill Richards and championed by Supervisor Karen Baja, the two departments have been nominally consolidated and now represent separate divisions of a new department of public safety.

The decision to vote on the proposal was surprising since the issue was not on the agenda of the trustees' meeting and was supposed to be referred to a special committee for study.

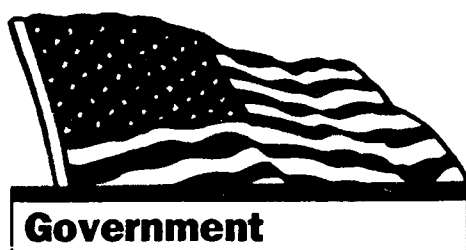
In voting against the measure, Trustee Gini Britton said she thought the matter was being rushed into place and that it was not a good idea to abandon the original plan to appoint an ad hoc committee to conduct a study. Others expressed similar sentiments, saying they felt uncomfortable voting on the issue so soon.

It is easy to sympathize with the three-trustee minority which dissented in this case. The dissenters were operating under the assumption that a procedure had been established that would allow for a protracted review of the proposal. They were taken aback when Treasurer Rick Engelland made the motion to consider.

But, despite the awkward manner in which the issue was broached, we think that the move to consolidate was a sound one and should help provide for a more streamlined delivery of public safety services in the township.

Nominal consolidation of police and fire services does not represent a drastic overhaul of the current system. Unlike total consolidation, it will not require the staffs of both departments to be cross-trained so that police officials could also serve as firefighters and vice versa.

Instead, nominal consolidation will simply allow for more centralized planning and administrative procedures. The staffs of the different divisions will work more closely in concert and acquire a greater understanding of their counterparts' responsibilities. Certain duplications will be eliminated, and emergen-

cies requiring a response from both police and fire will be handled with a greater degree of coordination.

Given the mild nature of the plan, it is difficult to appreciate Fire Chief Ricke Rosselle's contention that trustees "sold out the fire department" in voting for consolidation. On the contrary, we think nominal consolidation will enable both public safety divisions to operate at greater levels of efficiency and will ultimately provide township residents with optimum protection from crime and accidents.

Moreover, the fear that the departments might end up encroaching on each other's territory seems to us totally unfounded. Some transition will be necessary, but once limited integration is complete, we think people will be hard pressed to remember why anyone ever objected in the first place.

Now that's service — While we're on the subject of public safety responsiveness we have to take the occasion to give a pat on the back to township fire personnel who recently hoisted a trapped dog from a trench it had fallen into. The dog, an older collie, stumbled into a crevice that had been dug so that an underground water line could be installed. The owner and a neighbor tried their best to free the animal but just couldn't manage it.

After 45 minutes of struggling to no avail, the owner called for help. Fire Chief Ricke Rosselle was eventually notified at his home early the morning of Saturday, Sept. 4, and traveled to the house on Napier Road. He was joined there by other fire personnel and, together, they were able to pull the animal to safety.

It's the kind of caring, personalized service you figure went the way of the gas station attendant who used to clean your windshield. It's comforting to know some public employees are still willing to go above and beyond.

Police, press on same side

You know the old saying, "Be careful what you ask for. You may get it."

Those words are rolling around in my head right now as I sift through a veritable mountain of police reports, delivered to me last Friday by the Michigan State Police from the Northville post.

My mountain represents three months' worth of Freedom of Information requests filed at the Northville post. It's about as interesting

as reading the phone book; fewer characters, with only a slightly better plot.

I began visiting the post in June intending to cover the activity there just like we do with police departments in Northville, Northville Township and Novi. It's a valid service to the community. Readers like to know what sort of crimes are occurring in the neighborhood, and they also like to know that the police are earning the tax dollars we send them.

When I first started showing up at the post, the reception was less than warm. A secretary asked why I didn't have anything better to do. The post commander, Lt. David Werner, made it clear that he wasn't going to give us anything more than traffic accidents. "We're not letting (you) in our files," he announced.

Now, I certainly didn't care to rummage through the file cabinets at the state police post. It would be boring, unproductive and time-consuming. All I wanted was information, newsworthy information that would tell the people of Northville and Novi what was happening in their communities.

Instead, we were told to file our FOIs, and they would be fed into the red tape machine (i.e. the State Police Central Records Division in Lansing). The kicker was that we'd be billed for it all. For our first four requests, containing 104 reports, we were sent a bill for \$201.

A meeting with the new district commander, Capt. Chris Hogan, put us in the right direction. We've since set up an arrangement whereby I can get the information I need at the post, and the only cost to any of us is the small amount of time that Tpr. Norm Harrington will put in as media liaison.

I don't blame anyone at the Northville post for the problems that have occurred up to this point. For one thing, our timing was lousy. We decided to start visiting the post at a Thursday staff meeting, and on the following Monday, the then-post commander, Lt. Jack Moulik, was suspended for suspicion of misappropriating money from the post's petty cash fund. I started showing up at just the time folks at the post wished I wouldn't.

But a deeper problem lies a little bit higher up the organizational chart.

From what we've learned through the FOI, State Police headquarters in Lansing has issued some general departmental orders that contradict Michigan's Freedom of Information Act. And let's just say that you don't get to be a post commander or a captain in the state police by violating orders from Lansing.

Though the folks in Lansing are supposed to check with the Attorney General's office or other legal counsel when issuing general departmental orders, it appears that may not have been done in some cases. We'll have follow-up on it and let you know what we find.

The upshot is that once I've sifted through these reports, you'll know what's going on in your community. And without tipping our hand too much, I can tell you that there's more happening at the State Police post than just drunk driving arrests and walkaways from the state hospital. Some intriguing stories will be forthcoming.

Hopefully the folks at Post 21 now realize that we're walking on the same side of the street. After all, if we weren't, we wouldn't knock heads in the first place.

Comments about the 'news'

Two topics near and dear to my heart hit the front pages of *The Novi News* and *The Northville Record* last week. My comments:

THE FUERST HOMESTEAD: The homestead of Iva and Ruby Fuerst barely survived a vote of the Novi Board of Education recently.

Specifically, the board came within a single vote (4-3) of approving a motion to raze the old home and four barns outside the municipal-school complex at Ten Mile and Taft Road.

Iva and Ruby Fuerst are the two sisters, now deceased, who helped make the concept of a joint city/school complex a reality back in the '70s by selling a quarter-section of land to the school board for a song.

Cost was a major consideration in the board's deliberation. The cost of maintaining the buildings was estimated at approximately \$34,000.

While it's commendable for the school board to be concerned with finances, it's frightening that the board came within one vote of destroying one of the community's most unique treasures. Let's face it, \$34,000 is a rather paltry sum in a multi-million dollar budget.

Frankly, I have always regarded the existence of the old homestead as proof that Novi's leaders had their heads screwed on straight. I have never failed to pass that site without admiring the juxtaposition of the beautiful high school and municipal complex with the old farmstead.

It's sort of symbolic of the old Novi and the new Novi.

The narrow vote to tear down the old farm reminds me of the refrain from the song, "tear down paradise and put up a

parking lot."

NORTHVILLE TEACHER PACT: The Northville school board has reached a tentative agreement with the teachers union, according to the lead story in the Sept. 6 edition of *The Northville Record*.

What upsets me is that we, the taxpayers, don't know what it is — and apparently won't be able to find out the terms of the pact until after it's a done deal.

The front man for the school district is personnel director R. Roy Danley. And one of his jobs is to deliver the tired old cliché about not being able to disclose terms of the tentative agreement until it's been ratified by the teachers union.

Baloney. There's no law which says terms cannot be released. What happens is that both sides get together and decide not to release terms until it's too late for taxpayers to do anything about it.

The last time we allowed the school cartel to get away with this tactic, the board approved a contract which called for annual increases of 7 percent, 7 percent and 5.875 percent over three years. Add incremental increases and teachers were receiving increases of 12 percent and higher.

Which, of course, is why Northville kids now have to pay to participate in extracurricular activities.

Reform is needed. For starters, how about a law which bans approval of new contracts without proper disclosure of terms to the taxpayers and an appropriate public comment period.

The public education funding problem will continue until appropriate controls are placed on the people running our schools.

tional compensation for Snider or a change in title for Rosselle.

Township Clerk Sue Hillebrand and Trustees Gini Britton and Barbara O'Brien voted against the motion to approve the merger. All three wanted to adhere to what was on the agenda and study the proposal further.

"I was under the impression we were going to put together a committee to study it," the clerk said before voting against it.

The clerk said she believes the decision to consolidate the department was premature, considering trustees have agreed to research the notion of

consolidating five area police and fire departments under a shared service agreement. Hillebrand also said she didn't think it was fair to ask Snider to perform the additional responsibilities without the additional pay.

"I think there are hidden costs that we can't even see," Hillebrand said. "I think that the shared service talks need to come first and then public safety."

Engelland disagreed and believed that the township's consolidation plan wouldn't hinder joint service talks with Canton, Plymouth and the city of Northville.

Britton concurred with most of Hillebrand's concerns and said she

worried how the board's spontaneous action Thursday would sit with taxpayers.

"I personally would rather see this proposal go to committee," Britton said before casting her no vote. "... I think since we told people we were going to form a committee and study it we should do that. But now we are voting on it and I think it's going to look like we are pulling a fast one."

Trustee Mark Abbo said he supported the motion because he thinks it's in the best interests of the township.

"I feel that by consolidating we may be putting our resources together," he said.

Teens participate in discussion about establishing youth center

When White asked them to state why a youth center is needed, senior Amanda Cole replied, half-jokingly, "because Northville's boring and it's a better way to get to know people."

"Because we need a place to go," added fellow senior Ted Downs.

White summed up the sentiment when he said, "It's got to be a place where people can hang out and be themselves and have a good time."

For potential activities, the students cited a snack bar, video games, a pool table and large-screen televisions as necessities. Performances by local bands would be nice too, and White suggested the facility could act as an information center by listing the locations of popular musical groups and other activities.

Junior Farb Nivi added that the center should have a wide range of hours to let teens drop in whenever they wanted. Possible hours of opera-

tion ranged from after school lets out to 7 p.m. on weekdays with later hours on Friday and longer hours over the weekend.

Nivi said that a center could even help finance itself once it is up and running. "You throw in a couple of vending machines and pop machines and you'll bring in a lot of money," he guaranteed.

The teens' next task is to enlist support from fellow students by getting their signatures on a petition calling for a new youth center.

The adult task force, charged with reviewing a list of potential sites and securing a site, had little progress to report Wednesday. Owners of the vacant Hardee's Restaurant, a favorite site among local youth, hope to locate another fast-food restaurant in it. Task Force member Carol Strauch noted that the Open Door Christian Church is for sale, but said the owners are asking \$775,000.

Township Supervisor Karen Baja

sounded a more hopeful note when she noted that a shopping center on Seven Mile may have space available for rent. She added that the township is still seeking municipal space in the state-owned Wayne Community Living Services building at Five Mile and Sheldon, and suggested that space could probably be found in the five-story structure for a youth center.

Baja urged concerned residents to write to local legislators like Sen. R. Robert Geake, R-Northville, and Rep. Jerry Vorva, R-Plymouth, and ask them to pass pending legislation that would allow the state to donate buildings like Wayne Community Living Services to local municipalities.

The task force meets again Oct. 5 at 7 p.m. to review progress on locating a site and continue planning what form a youth center should take. Meetings are held at the First Baptist Church, 217 N. Wing St., in the second floor Youth Room.

Loire Valley wines not just garden variety

Loire Valley, France — affectionately and correctly called "The Garden of France." This is the region of crisp white wines produced from sauvignon blanc grapes, delicious, juicy reds predominantly made from cabernet franc and refreshing sparkling wines from chenin blanc.

This is the magical land where medieval knights constructed fortresses, where the 15th and 16th century French kings built incredible pleasure castles, and where the 17th and 18th century nobility built chateaux. Today, residents go about their daily life and take the tourists meandering through their medieval village, or awing at the magnitude of a chateau, as a matter of course.

Vast farms abound. Each property, whether it's sufficiently large to be referred to as an estate or a small, local vigneron (grapegrower) produces wines generally uncluttered by wood. If cooptage is used, it's old, neutral, and simply a vessel in which to carry on centuries-old winemaking traditions. The wines have expressive fruit indicative of their origin and have not been wood-crafted into something other than what nature offered the vintage.

These are not ponderous wines or wines for extended cellaring. They are wines for pleasurable drinking. Sauvignons (as they are called, leaving off the blanc) match perfectly with the local goat cheese which can be purchased a day or two old, weeks old, or so well-aged that it can be grated.

Cabernet franc pairs marvelously with roasted goat or leg of lamb, served at one of the local ferme-auberge (local farms with lodging and a small restaurant). If you like very fruity red wines, then Gamay fills the bill.

Let's take a closer look at the Loire Valley in west-central France that takes its name from the Loire River which flows east to west for nearly 350 miles before emptying into the Atlantic Ocean west of the city of Nantes.

Starting in the east is Pouilly-sur-Loire and Sancerre, each with a unique style of sauvignon blanc. From Pouilly sur Loire the wines are labeled Pouilly Fume (not to be confused with Pouilly-Fuisse from the Burgundy region). Just across the river to the west is Sancerre with a different soil profile and terrain lending a mineral, crispness to sauvignon blanc.

Travelling west, one enters the Loire Valley's Touraine region, roughly following the Loire River east of the city of Tours (about 3.5 hours by car, southwest of Paris). Here chenin blanc produces its most famous wines Vouvray and Montlouis. Vouvray is versatile and is made dry, semi-dry, sweet or sparkling.

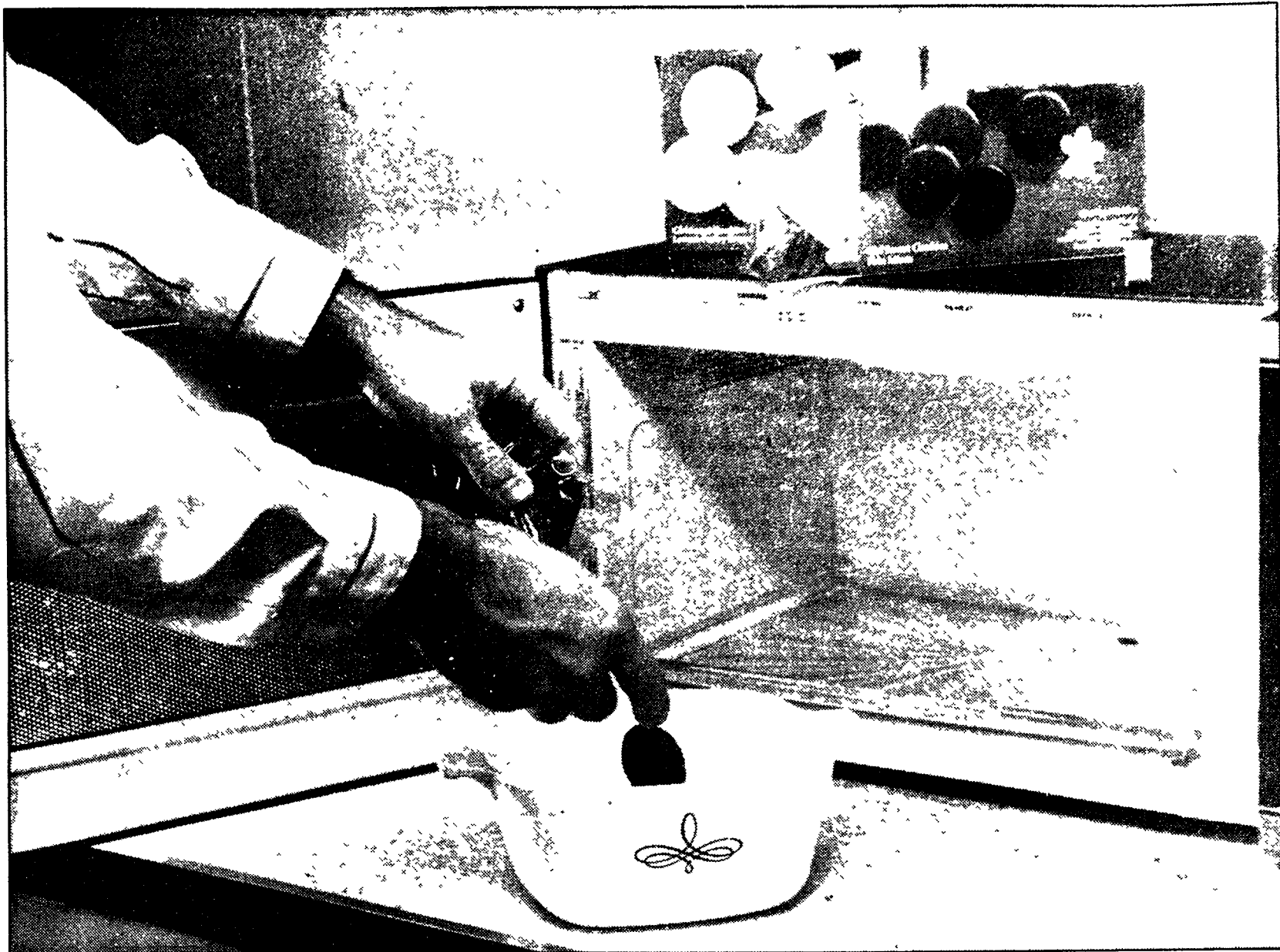

A little know-how Learn how microwaves work their magic

The mechanics of microwaves are no mystery.

Modern technology has created so many amazing conveniences that make everyday living easier, but we often take them for granted. Cars, televisions, radios, computers — we may use them every day, but how many of us know how they all work?

Microwaves are very short (hence the "micro") high-frequency electromagnetic waves. It might surprise you to learn that everything emits microwaves — the potted plant on your desk, your toaster, even you. But your microwave harnesses these tiny waves to generate cooking power.

Radio waves, television waves and even ordinary daylight are all waves of differing frequencies. You might think of your microwave oven as a miniature broadcasting system, but instead of sending long waves out, it generates short waves that concentrate in a small area.

In your microwave oven, a magnetron tube converts electricity into microwaves. They can't pass through the metal walls of the oven, but they can penetrate glass, porcelain, paper and other materials to reach the food you want to cook.

Microwave energy is attracted to moisture, sugar and fat molecules in food, causing these molecules to vibrate millions of times per second. All this jiggling friction results in heat, and this is what gets things cooking.

Of course, density and moisture will vary from potato to potato, and fat content will vary from roast to roast, so cooking times are always approximate.

You don't need to add fat to keep foods from sticking in the microwave, but a little additional butter, margarine or oil will attract microwave energy, and this can speed the already fast cooking process even further. A sprinkle of water can also

help dry foods to heat more efficiently.

Foods that are higher in moisture will attract microwaves and cook faster than those lower in moisture. Be careful when heating sandwiches and sweet rolls with fruit or cheese fillings. The bread outside may feel only slightly warm, but fillings can be quite hot, so check inside temperature before taking that first bite.

Some final safety hints: because microwave cooking creates steam pressure within foods as molecules heat, you need to be more careful to pierce skins or membranes of foods like sausages, eggs, potatoes, etc. This allows built-up steam to escape and prevents messy explosions. Remove plastic wrap and lids with care to avoid steam burns.

In a conventional oven, hot air does the cooking. But with a microwave, food heats up — not the oven. Heat will transfer from food to cooking utensils, however, so hot pads are in order when removing containers from the oven.

RED SNAPPER DIJON

2 teaspoons butter or margarine
½ teaspoon paprika
¼ cup sour cream
1 teaspoon Dijon mustard
¼ teaspoon lemon pepper
¼ cup seasoned bread crumbs
¼ teaspoon dried parsley flakes
1 pound red snapper fillets, in serving-size pieces
Yields 3 to 4 servings.
Preparation time, 5 minutes
Cooking time: 5 to 6½ minutes (plus 3 minutes standing time).

Oven setting: High (100 percent power).
Place butter or margarine in 8 x 8-inch microwave-safe baking dish. Add pa-

prika. Microwave about 1 minute, to melt. Tilt dish to spread melted butter and paprika evenly over bottom. Set aside.

Combine sour cream, mustard and lemon pepper in shallow bowl. In separate bowl, combine bread crumbs and parsley, toss with fork to combine.

Rinse fish and pat dry with paper towels. Dip fillets first in sour cream mustard mixture, then in bread crumb mixture to coat. Arrange baking dish with thicker portions toward outside. Cover dish with paper towel and microwave 4 to 5½ minutes, or until fish flakes easily with fork. Let stand 3 minutes before serving.

BRUSSELS SPROUTS WITH TARRAGON BUTTER

1 pound fresh brussels sprouts
¼ cup water
2 tablespoons butter or margarine
¼ teaspoon dried tarragon
¼ teaspoon pepper
Yields 4 servings.
Preparation time, 10 minutes
Cooking time, 10 to 14 minutes
Oven setting: High (100 percent power).

Rinse brussels sprouts thoroughly and trim off stems, remove any wilted outer leaves. Soak in cold, lightly salted water about 10 minutes. Rinse under cold running water and drain.

Combine brussels sprouts and water in 2 quart microwave safe casserole. Cover and microwave 8 to 12 minutes, or until sprouts are tender, stirring gently halfway through cooking time. Turn into colander to drain.

Place butter, tarragon and pepper in 1-cup glass measure. Microwave 2 minutes to melt.

Transfer sprouts to serving dish. Drizzle seasoned butter over top, toss gently, and serve.

ALMOND FUDGE

½ cup butter OR margarine
2 (1-ounce) squares unsweetened baking chocolate
¼ cup half and half
1 teaspoon vanilla
¾ cups powdered sugar
1 cup coarsely chopped toasted almonds
Yields about 3 dozen pieces
Preparation time, 5 minutes
Cooking time, 1½ to 3 minutes (plus 1 hour to chill)

Oven setting: Medium high (70 percent power).

Combine butter, chocolate and half and-half in 2 quart microwave safe mixing bowl. Microwave 1½ to 3 minutes, or until better melts. Stir with wooden spoon until chocolate melts and mixture is smooth.

Stir in vanilla. Gradually beat in powdered sugar until fudge is creamy (add in chopped almonds).

Turn mixture into lightly buttered 8x8 inch pan, spread smooth with spatula. Cover and chill for 1 hour. Cut into squares.

Recipes in this column are tested in 625-700 watt microwave ovens.

MICRO-TIP OF WEEK

Microwave energy causes food's molecules to move, creating heat friction, and this is what cooks your food. Fractional heat continues even after food is removed from your microwave, and recipes calling for "standing time" take this into account as part of the total cooking time.

Gala proceeds will benefit Interlochen and support the summer residency of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra at Interlochen.

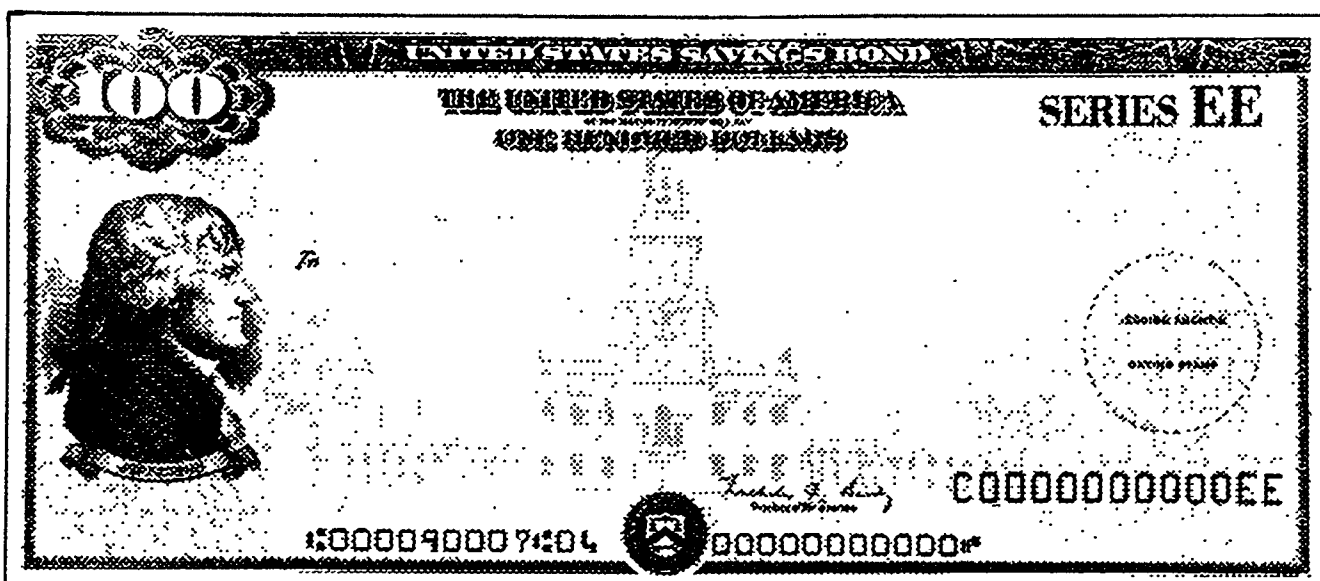

Gather fresh fruit to freeze this fall

Garden fresh vegetables, tree sweetened fruits, homemade berry pies, and grandma's tomato sauce can be frozen now and enjoyed on cold days in January. The bountiful harvest in your garden, local farmers market, roadside stands and other markets can provide fresh produce at their peak. Make menu planning easier: fill your freezer full of good tasting frozen foods.

Air is the main enemy to quality frozen foods, so packaging is extremely important. The exposure to air can give foods an off color (gray), and off flavor and a tough white dry surface, called freezer burn. Don't use waxed paper, bread wrappers, cottage cheese containers, plastic film or brittle plastic containers in the freezer. None of these are airtight and you run the risk of freezer burn and some may even crack at low temperatures.

Make the packages as airtight as possible. Foods packed in plastic bags should be laid on a hard surface, and pressed with your hand gently to force the air out. A flexible freezer bag should be twisted very tightly at the top with a tie. Do not use cellophane tape in the freezer, it will not hold. For best results, package all foods in moisture and vapor-proof freezer containers or bags that are specifically labeled for freezer use.

To keep foods as close to fresh as possible, they should be no warmer than room temperature before freezing. Refrigerate hot foods before you freeze them. Package food in quantities that are practical for your size family. Freezing tears the food cell structures, so thawed uncooked food is more susceptible to bacteria and should be cooked or served within 24 hours of thawing. The smaller the package the quicker it freezes and flat packages freeze faster than bulky ones.

When packing the freezer, leave some space around containers to allow for air circulation. Packages can be stacked after freezing. Keep your freezer set at 0 degrees F. or colder. Anything above 0 degrees, the enzyme activity and other chemical changes start to spoil food.

Raw vegetables need to be blanched before freezing. Blanching stops enzymes that cause spoilage, and helps retain nutrients and color. The vegetables can be water, steam or microwave blanched. Blanching times are different for each vegetable, find a chart that gives you exact times.

After blanching, submerge vegetables immediately in ice water until they are cool. (The faster the heating and cooling process, the better quality product). Drain well, place in freezer containers and freeze. Date all packages so this winter you'll know what you have. Putting a "use by" date will help determine the first in, first out packages.

Vegetables that are used primarily as seasoning, such as onions and green pepper can be frozen raw, without blanching. Herbs can be frozen whole or chopped. Wash them, and dry well on paper towels, chop finely and freeze in freezer bags.

Raw fruits need no blanching. Choose the freshest, ripe fruits, not over ripe unless you'll be making jam or a sauce. Fruits or blanched vegetables can be frozen on cookie sheets to keep the produce separate and not a frozen block. When they are frozen, transfer to airtight containers. To prevent discoloration of fruit, treat with a small amount of ascorbic or citric acid. Packing fruits in a syrup pack generally keeps them firmer, juicier and more flavorful than other methods. Sugar- and honey-packed fruits are best for making pies. A dry pack or diet packed fruit will be very soft when thawed so eat when they are still partially frozen. When freezing foods with a liquid allow room for expansion.

Combination dishes will keep at 0 degrees F. up to eight weeks. Undercook vegetables, beans, pasta and rice. When they are reheated, these will become tender rather than be overcooked. Use little or no salt when freezing as salt inhibits freezing.

Press crust mixture evenly onto bottom and sides of prepared pie plate. Bake 12 to 15 minutes or until golden brown. Fill baked pie crust with desired filling. Yield: one 9-inch pie crust.

To freeze baked pie crust: Wrap in heavy-duty aluminum plastic wrap or aluminum foil or place in plastic freezer bag or airtight container. Label, date and store in freezer up to four months. To thaw baked crust: Unwrap; let stand at room temperature. Or, place in 375 degree oven for 5 minutes.

ALL-AMERICAN FRUIT CRUMBLE PIE

Filling:

- Two 21-ounce cans apple or peach pie filling
- ½ cup raisins
- ½ teaspoon ground cinnamon
- Crumble topping:
- ½ cup oats (quick or old-fashioned)

PUMPKIN SILK PIE

- Two 8-ounce packages cream cheese, softened
- One 16-ounce can (1½ cups) pumpkin
- 1½ cups powdered sugar
- 2 teaspoons vanilla
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- ½ teaspoon ground nutmeg
- ½ teaspoon ground ginger
- 2 cups thawed non-dairy whipped topping
- ½ cup coarsely chopped pecans (optional)

Loire wines boast a simpler style

A trip along the Loire west of Tours brings one to the heart of the Loire's red wines in Bourgueil and Chinon. These reds are made from the cabernet franc grape and are bigger, more earthy wines for heartier meat preparations — beef stews and game in particular. Chinon is generally lighter than a Bourgueil and can be drunk young or mature. It's a lively pairing for roast chicken, red meats or tangy cheeses.

Anjou (where half the production is rose wine from cabernet franc) and Saumur (with its crisp chenin blanc sparkling wines) are the Touraine's western neighbors. Besides rose, the Anjou region is famed for white wines from subregions. Savennieres wines are crisp, but Coteaux du Layon

makes sweet finesseful dessert wines often rivaling a fine sauternes.

Between the city of Angers and the mouth of the Loire at the Atlantic is Muscadet. The grape varietal melon de Bourgogne reigns supreme for production of a crisp, white wine perfectly suited for the broad spectrum of fruits de mer (shellfish) from the Atlantic. It's the perfect complement for oysters on the half shell.

Today's savvy wine shopper does not need to take a trip to France to learn about these wines. Many are being imported into the United States. The following are Loire wines and producers to look for. If you can't find them in your favorite wine shop, ask the retailer to order them for you.

After 'Cheers,' 'Frasier'

begins something new in Seattle

Among the new shows NBC is launching this fall, few are generating as much positive word of mouth as "Frasier," the "Cheers" spin-off premiering Thursday, Sept. 16. Small surprise, then, that the last thing the cast wants to discuss is the A-word: "AfterMASH."

Like "Frasier," that 1983 comedy followed a monumentally successful series ("M*A*S*H") and featured some of the same creative forces that had kept the original show near the top of the Nielsens for a decade. While other spinoffs have been far more serious artistic disasters (remember "The Tortellis"), perhaps none has fallen as far short of expectations as "AfterMASH," which lasted barely a year.

"This is our show, this is not 'After' anything," says "Frasier" star Kelsey Grammer. "We have a new show, based on a character that's been around for a while."

Judging from the pilot episode, directed by "Cheers" veteran James Burrows, "Frasier" is indeed a refreshing creation in its own right. His marriage to starchy Dr. Lilith Sternin-Crane now dissolved, Frasier Crane (Grammer) has returned

to his hometown of Seattle to start a new life. Tired of his psychiatric practice, he accepts a new challenge as a radio-show therapist, assisted by Roz Doyle (Peri Gilpin). While Frasier gets his fill of neurotics over the phone lines, his private life is scarcely less cluttered with zanies and dysfunctionals.

His married brother, Niles (David Hyde Pierce from "Powers That Be"), is the chilly embodiment of their late mother's philosophy that "a handshake is as good as a hug." Martin (John Mahoney, "In the Line of Fire"), their father, is a proud ex-cop who bitterly resents the fact that a hip injury has forced him to move in with Frasier. Worst of all, for Frasier, his father brings along his best friend—Eddie, a strange little terrier who loves to sit idly and stare at Frasier. Caring for Martin while his son is at work is Daphne Moon (Jane Leeves, "Murphy Brown"), a blissfully ditzy Manchester, England, lass who confesses to being "a bit psychic."

David Lee, who wrote the pilot with co-executive producers David Angell and Peter Casey, emphasizes that "Frasier" will not be another generic workplace comedy. Generally, what we're going to deal with

is the relationship between an adult child and his father.

"The thing that we think the great chunk of Americans our age are going through right now, after having children, ...is what do you do with your parents," he explains. "(The show) was going to be a workplace comedy...and we decided that had a lot of similarities to other shows. Then we became much more interested in the emotional appeal of what parents and their children go through as they get older."

Grammer himself has gone through a lot in recent months, serving as tabloid fodder with much-publicized drug and marital problems, and he professes to get a big boost from the audience's fondness for Frasier.

"I think the audience is dying to see this show. A number of people at an airport or something will come up to me and go, 'Good luck with the new show, can't wait to see it,'" he relates. "I think maybe there is a residual excitement that they're not going to lose everybody, like I'm the Methadone clinic of 'Cheers' addicts or something. I think the best thing that Frasier always carried was that he changed every year, that he was moving, always.

"It's 'After' nothing. It's the beginning of something new."
