## School trustees seek improved communication

Northville Board of Education members hope to take the first step in improving communication with the public at tonight's meeting.

The board is expected to appoint two of its members as liaisons to the PTA/PTSA Coordinating Council and the Advocates for Quality Education.

Board President Robert McMahon said the move will make it easier for the two groups to participate in the board's process.

"These two groups have been very supportive," he said. "We need to promote that partnership."

Currently, there are board liaisons assigned to the Northville Recreation Department, Northville Youth Assistance and the senior citizens.

Other examples suggested by board members at a study session last week to heighten community awareness included beefing up the "School News," the district's newsletter; streamlining board meetings; preparing one-page news briefs highlighting actions taken at the last board of education meeting; and following a set schedule for sub-committee meetings.

"We just have to keep in mind the

limited time we have as board members and staff," McMahon said. "Some of us are spread pretty thin now. We have to really decide we can't do all the things we want to."

Superintendent Leonard Reznierski suggested sub-committee meetings be held on the first and third Wednesdays of the month, alternating with regular board meetings on the second and fourth Mondays.

"That doesn't mean you can't call an emergency meeting, however. You will have something established," Reznierski said.

McMahon said agendas could also be ready on Friday so the public as well as board members would have a chance to review the topics for that meeting before actually attending it.

The alternate Monday night meetings could also be held for public hearings or study sessions if there were a lack of agenda items for a sub-committee meeting.

Glenna Davis, secretary of the board, wholeheartedly agreed with the recommendation. She said it would put some structure in her life if she knew what night she would have a commitment.

## Man dies after high-speed chase

What began as a minor hit-and-run car accident in the Milford area resulted in the death of a Hartland man due to a heart attack at I-275 near Seven Mile Road Wednesday afternoon.

Lawrence Conrad Whelton, 56, was southbound on I-275 at 1:40 p.m. when his 1991 Dodge pickup crossed the center median and struck a northbound 1988 Oldsmobile driven by David McKinnon, 35, of Walled Lake.

The impact tore the left rear wheel assembly away from McKinnon's car. Pieces of the Oldsmobile's rear seat upholstery were found on the bumper of Whelton's truck which came to rest against the east embankment.

Whelton died at 2:20 p.m. at Botsford Memorial Hospital. The Oakland County Medical Examiner's office confirmed Whelton's cause of death as a heart attack.

McKinnon, who was wearing his

safety belt, was treated and released at Botsford.

Though the Michigan State Police have yet to complete their investigation into the incident, witnesses at the scene reported that Whelton had been involved in a minor hit-and-run accident in the Milford area some time earlier. When he failed to stop at the accident scene, the driver of the second vehicle apparently gave chase. Witnesses reported Whelton and his pursuer reached speeds of close to 100 mph and were passing cars on the shoulder.

Police questioned the driver and passenger of the alleged pursuing vehicle, which stopped at the scene of the second crash. No information was available on whether charges will be filed against that driver.

Investigation into the crash resulted in numerous traffic stoppages and closed the northbound ramp from Seven Mile to the freeway. Traffic tie ups continued into the evening rush hour.

## Suspect faces charges in several venues

Andre Joseph Tundo's extended date with the judicial system of three states has begun anew.

Tundo, already wanted for escaping from a Kentucky jail, was arrested by Novi police Sept. 12 after a high-speed chase on Novi and Grand River roads. He was fleeing after allegedly walking out of a real estate agent's open house in Northville with several pieces of jewelry, but the larceny charge for that crime is just one of several he now faces.

Tundo waived his right to a preliminary examination into the charge at Plymouth's 35th District Court Sept. 24, and his case was bound over to Oakland County Circuit Court. He'll be arraigned there Oct. 14.

Northville City police turned him over to the Oakland County Sheriff's

Tundo is also wanted in Macomb County for failure to pay child support in 1988, in Kentucky for escaping from jail while serving out a sentence for 13 counts of receiving and concealing stolen goods, and Clearwater, Fla. for auto theft. . .

Department following the Sept. 24 court hearing. His bond was continued at \$50,000, with no allowance for a 10-percent cash bond.

The city's charge is just the first in a series that Tundo will have to answer to, said Sgt. Gary Callender. After that, Novi police are considering charging him with reckless driving and fleeing a police officer for the high-speed chase that led to his capture.

Tundo is also wanted in Macomb

while," Callender said.

Locally, Tundo's saga began Sunday afternoon, Sept. 12, when he toured an Andover Drive home being shown by Plymouth real estate agent Rick Birdsall. After he left, Birdsall noticed jewelry missing from a dresser in the master bedroom and drove after him, following the fugitive east on Eight Mile to Novi Road while he notified Northville City police on his cellular phone.

Northville police notified Novi authorities, who spotted Tundo's red Chevrolet at Novi and Grand River as he cut through the Mobil station to avoid the red light. They caught up with him outside the Fair Lane Hotel just west of Taft, and he surrendered in a field just west of the hotel.

Police found several items of jewelry, a cellular phone stolen from Kentucky, a pager, and a Virginia license plate in the car, which had Tennessee plates installed.

## Neighbors work toward David Totten memorial

For such a gentle man, David Totten had a strong impact on a lot of people's lives.

His neighbors want to help the rest of Northville remember that impact by sponsoring a memorial on his behalf. A longtime planning commissioner and neighborhood activist, Totten died May 13 at the age of 68 following extensive heart surgery.

Totten began establishing a local legacy of community involvement shortly after moving to Northville

with wife Carolyn and sons Charles, Daniel, James and John in 1976. He was one of the first members of the Cabbagetown Residents' Association, and helped found Concerned Residents of Northville in 1987.

Fellow Cabbagetowner Luci Klink hamer said her association, together with Concerned Residents and the city's planning commissioners, want to provide the community with a lasting memorial to that involvement.

The associations hope to raise enough money to fund a memorial

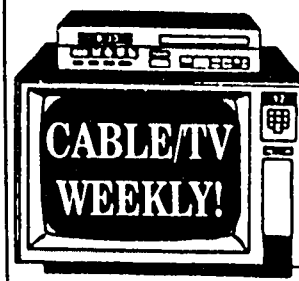

# Officials try to improve links with community

"It would be easier on the staff and central office," McMahon said. "And the community," added Jean Hansen, vice-president.

Hansen also added a plug for the return of the board briefs, a brief scenario of the previous night's board meeting sent to building administrators to post in their schools.

"I feel the votes should be recorded, too," Hansen said of the one-page brief. "It should also be sent out with the monthly newsletters. That way all parents have an opportunity to learn what happens at the board meetings."

As far as the "School News" is concerned, any sort of change could

prove to be tough.

"I think the format needs to be changed again," Hansen said. "It needs to be more reader friendly, easier to read. There needs to be more emphasis on the issues. I know it's nice to read about kids..."

Some board members objected, saying parents loved reading and seeing pictures of children's accomplishments. Hansen countered that the newsletter needed to balance the two items more carefully.

"This is our vehicle to get the issues broadened," Hansen said. "We should use it to our benefit."

Dolly McMaster, assistant superintendent for instructional services, balked at the suggestion.

"It takes a lot of time to write, interview and search out such information," she said. "We've been doing the School News on a wing and a prayer. We don't have a public relations-type person to do it. That's the reason why there's more fluff."

McMaster reminded the board that her department is minus an assistant and secretary due to the departure of William Hamilton, former director of instructional services. He took a job with the Walled Lake

school district this summer.

Treasurer Richard Brown asked if high school journalism students would be available to put together the newsletter.

"They're kids," McMaster said. "It takes a lot of coordination (to research and put the newsletter together)."

The assistant superintendent said the board may want to consider contracting a public relations person to put together the newsletter. Davis

added she thought the newsletter's format were should also be published more than four times a year.

Reznierski suggested the board let the administration come up with suggestions before any changes in

the newsletter's format were instituted. "We're tight as a drum (staff-wise)," he said. "We can go through and change the whole 'School News' and find out no one reads it anyhow."

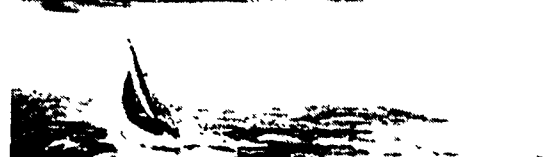

- Outcomes-based education.
- Classroom quality issues possibly including class size, curriculum continuity, role of the principal and teacher evaluations.
- Sharing community resources such as libraries and technology.
- Collective bargaining and personnel concerns.
- Substance abuse education.
- School boundaries.

The format of the Advocates' meetings will follow last year's theme. Following a brief business meeting at the beginning of the meeting, members will break into sub-committees to discuss issues and make recommendations to the steering committee.

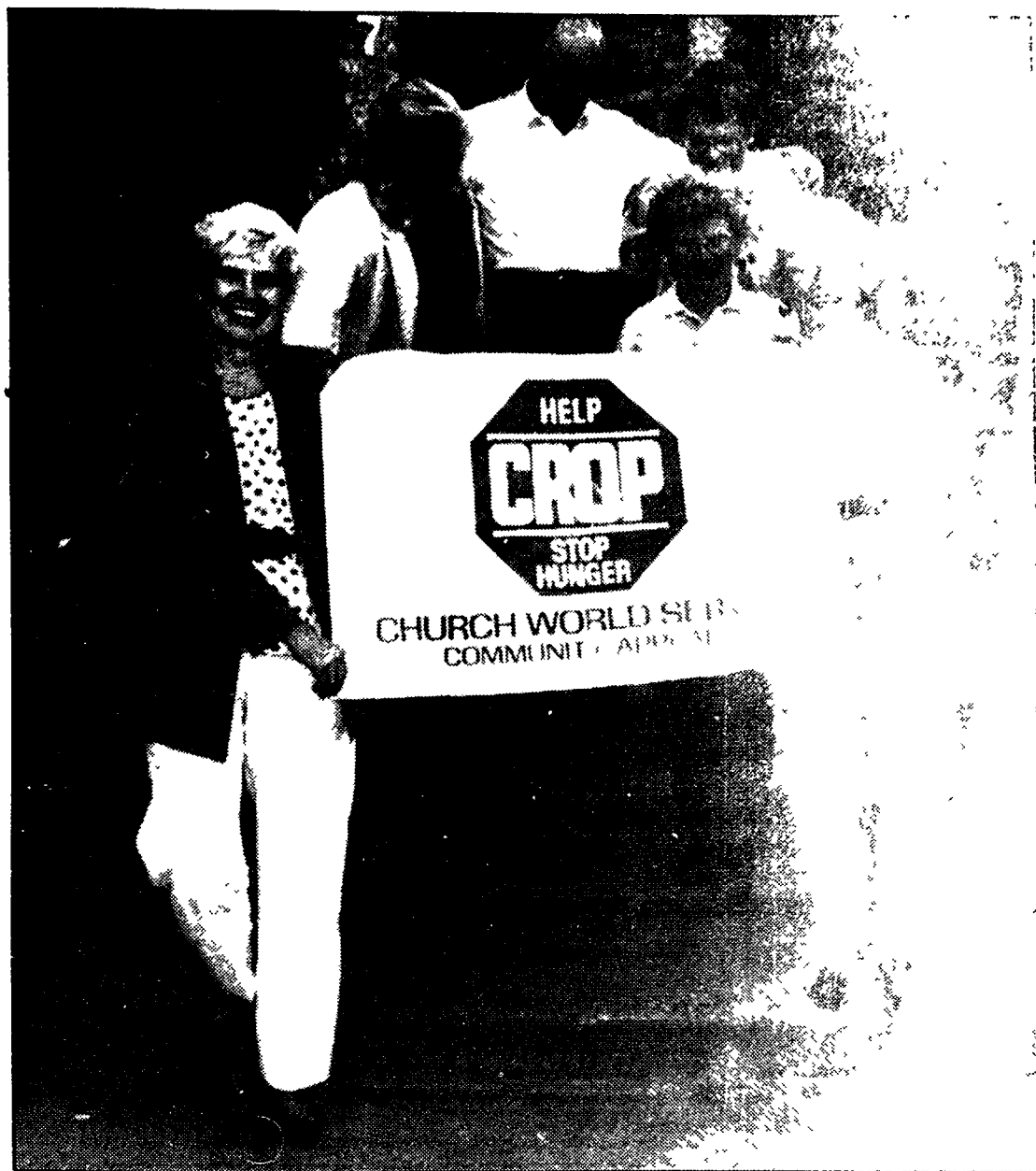

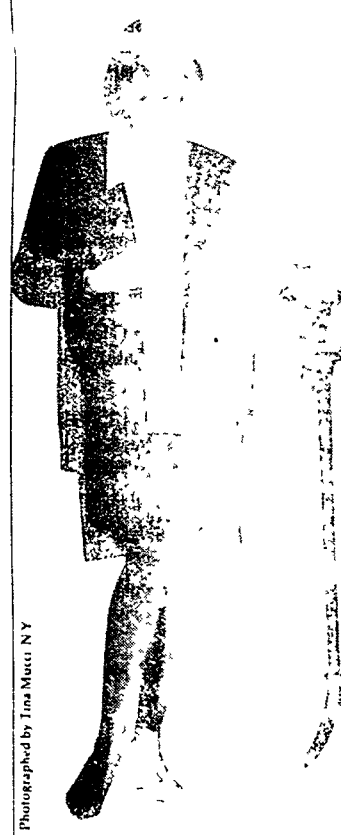

"It would be easier on the staff and central office," McMahon said.

"And the community," added Jean Hansen, vice-president.

Hansen also added a plug for the return of the board briefs, a brief scenario of the previous night's board meeting sent to building administrators to post in their schools.

"I feel the votes should be recorded, too," Hansen said of the one-page brief. "It should also be sent out with the monthly newsletters. That way all parents have an opportunity to learn what happens at the board meetings."

As far as the "School News" is concerned, any sort of change could

prove to be tough.

"I think the format needs to be changed again," Hansen said. "It needs to be more reader friendly, easier to read. There needs to be more emphasis on the issues. I know it's nice to read about kids..."

Some board members objected, saying parents loved reading and seeing pictures of children's accomplishments. Hansen countered that the newsletter needed to balance the two items more carefully.

"This is our vehicle to get the issues broadened," Hansen said. "We should use it to our benefit."

Dolly McMaster, assistant superintendent for instructional services, balked at the suggestion.

"It takes a lot of time to write, interview and search out such information," she said. "We've been doing the School News on a wing and a prayer. We don't have a public relations-type person to do it. That's the reason why there's more fluff."

McMaster reminded the board that her department is minus an assistant and secretary due to the departure of William Hamilton, former director of instructional services. He took a job with the Walled Lake

school district this summer.

Treasurer Richard Brown asked if high school journalism students would be available to put together the newsletter.

"They're kids," McMaster said. "It takes a lot of coordination (to research and put the newsletter together)."

The assistant superintendent said the board may want to consider contracting a public relations person to put together the newsletter. Davis

added she thought the newsletter's format were should also be published more than four times a year.

Rezmierski suggested the board let the administration come up with suggestions before any changes in

the newsletter's format were instituted. "We're tight as a drum (staff-wise)," he said. "We can go through and change the whole 'School News' and find out no one reads it anyhow."

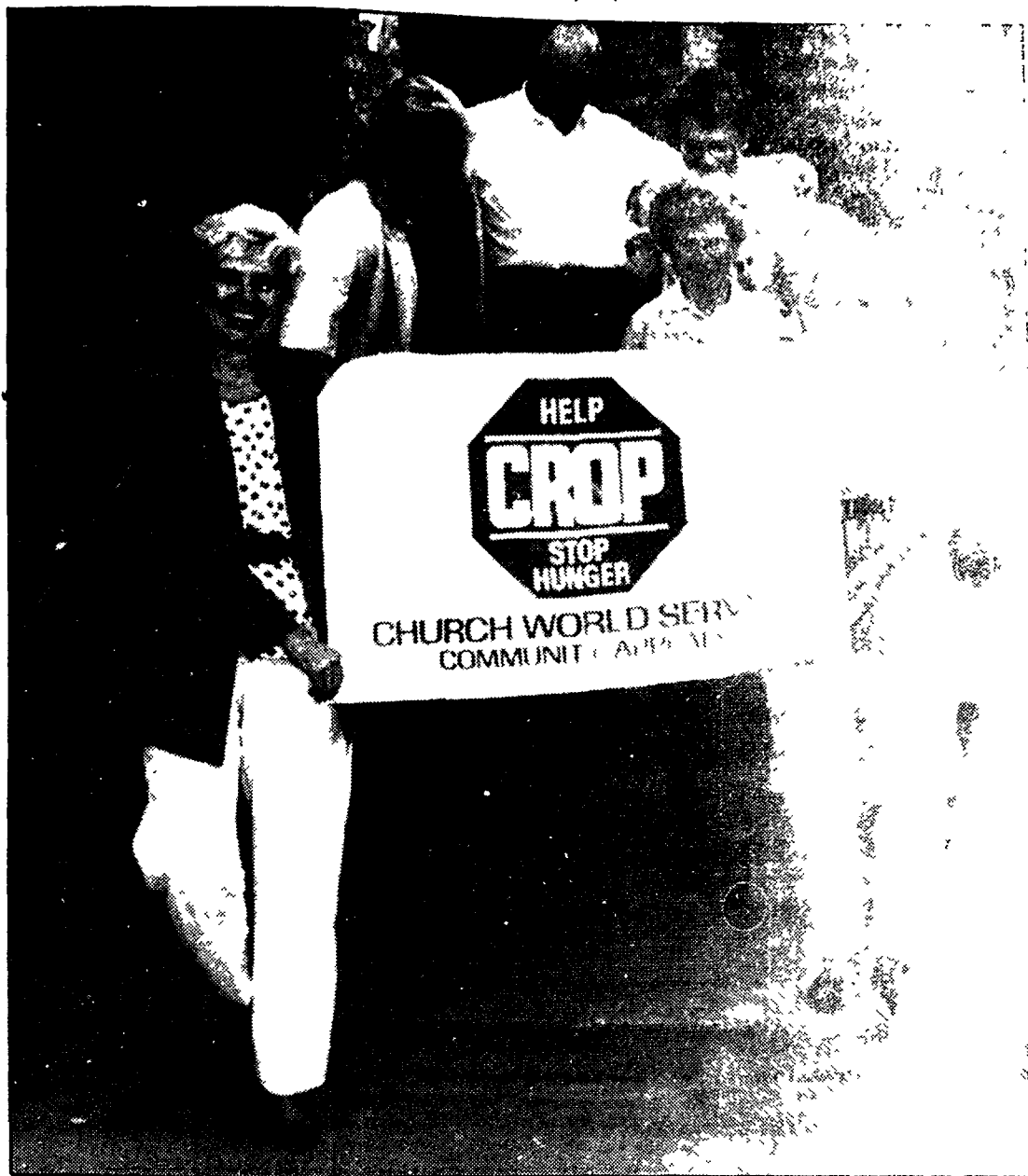

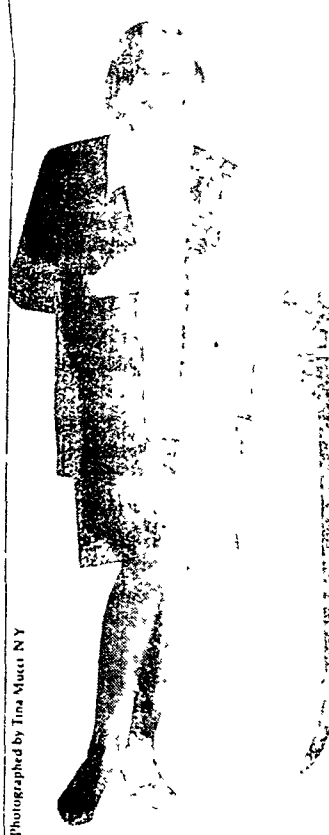

# Two men arrested on weapons violation charges

## Drivers were under influence during accidents

Drug tests conducted by St. Mary Hospital in Livonia have confirmed city police suspicions that the drivers in two June traffic accidents were under the influence at the time.

The results, released Aug. 31, indicated that a 36-year-old Dearborn man who caused a June 6 crash had elevated levels of codeine in his system, while the 34-year-old Howell woman involved in a June 19 collision was intoxicated.

In the first accident June 6, the Dearborn man, driving a Dodge Raider east on Eight Mile Road, plowed into the back of a car stopped for a red light at Eight Mile and Novi Road.

The 9:45 a.m. accident totaled both vehicles and left all passengers with injuries. The elderly Northville couple inside the stopped car had to be extricated from the wreckage of their vehicle.

Witnesses said the Dearborn man appeared to be intoxicated, and had

drifted across the center line several times before the collision. He did not appear to notice the stopped car until just before he hit it at between 40-50 mph. He never braked, they said, but he did swerve to one side just before the crash.

The man, who collapsed the car's steering wheel and smashed its windshield upon impact, was taken to St. Mary Hospital with a concussion. A search of his vehicle turned up a bottle of cough syrup containing codeine that was one-third full and two types of allergy tablets. The cough syrup prescription had been filled the day before the accident.

The man, interviewed by city police while he was recuperating at St. Mary, thought that the accident had occurred on I-96 near I-275. He expressed surprise when told where the accident actually took place, and said he was not sure how he got there. He denied being under the influence at the time.

The man said the cough syrup and other medication had been prescribed because of a lung ailment

that had resulted in the partial removal of one lung several years ago.

Subsequent interviews with acquaintances and family members painted a portrait of a man who had worked as a pharmacist and developed a dependency on codeine in the past. Another pharmacist told city police that there should have been much more cough syrup left in the bottle if the man was taking the medication as prescribed, and agreed that the medication and allergy tablets could cause drowsiness.

Urine samples taken after the accident, released by the hospital Aug. 31, revealed elevated levels of codeine.

The man turned himself in to city police Sept. 22 and was placed under arrest for operating a motor vehicle under the influence of narcotics, and was released after posting a \$500 personal bond. He faces a Sept. 29 arraignment date at 35th District Court.

The other accident involved a 34-year-old Howell woman who turned onto eastbound Eight Mile from northbound Center Street just after midnight June 19. Witnesses to that crash said the woman appeared to turn right and then change her mind, continuing straight across the intersection into the path of a full-size pickup truck heading east.

The eastbound driver swerved into the westbound lanes but was unable to avoid her, according to witnesses. His speed was estimated at 40-45 mph when they collided, and both vehicles were totaled.

When police arrived, the woman was unconscious and an off-duty Ann Arbor police officer was leaning in through the driver's side window and holding her head steady to prevent further injury to her spinal cord. A Northville City police officer who entered the car from the passenger

side to check on her noticed that her breath smelled like alcohol.

The pickup truck driver complained of injuries but none were visible and he declined medical attention.

The woman was taken to St. Mary by Community Emergency Medical Services. A search of her car turned up a pint vodka bottle, a half-pint vodka bottle and a bottle of Caribbean Fruit Punch, all nearly empty.

The woman subsequently told police she had "a couple of drinks" before driving. But blood tests conducted by St. Mary measured her blood-alcohol level at .299 percent, nearly three times the legal limit.

She was charged with driving under the influence of alcohol and possessing an unlawful blood-alcohol level after turning herself in to city police Sept. 21. She was released after posting a \$500 personal bond and receiving a Sept. 24 ar-

raignment date at 35th District Court.

Much of the delay between the accidents and the charges was due to the difficulty in obtaining test results from St. Mary Hospital, said Police Chief Rod Cannon.

"In order to get that release of information, our attorney had to write for clearance," he said. "Then when you get the report back, you have to decipher the darn thing. . . you need a technical breakdown into layman's terms."

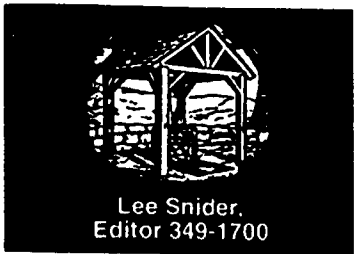

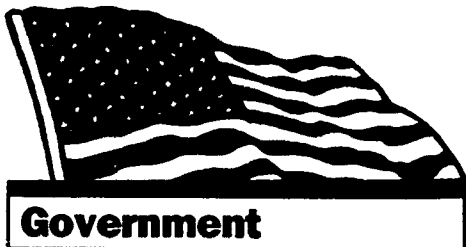

### Paving grant must be used before it is lost

It's hard to believe a government would stand around and watch as \$530,000 in grant money slipped through its fingers, but that's exactly what Northville Township seems to be doing.

Township Trustee Russ Fogg has issued the warning that, unless action is taken soon, a grant the township received from the Michigan Department of Transportation could be withdrawn. The money was meant to help finance the paving of Gerald Avenue, but problems have held up the project and the deadline for using the funds is fast approaching.

Discrepancies in obtaining assessment figures and setback requirements have prevented the establishment of a special assessment district and stalled paving of the 1/2 mile stretch of roadway. As a result, the project, which took volunteers and officials four years to pre-

pare, is in jeopardy.

We would strongly urge township officials to step up their efforts to remove the obstacles blocking progress on paving Gerald Avenue. A second public hearing on the issue is set for Thursday, and officials should spare no effort in getting the necessary figures in hand by that time.

Loss of the grant would represent a huge waste of time and effort, and would be yet one more example of how government inefficiency worked against, rather than for, its constituents.

### Another great festival goes into record books

Because it happens every year and because it's always great, there's a tendency to take it all for granted. But the annual Victorian Festival doesn't just happen by itself. The spectacular affair is the product of a multitude of individual and group efforts.

This year, festival organizers seemed to have outdone themselves. In addition to food booths, street musicians, games, carriage rides, the costume ball and the antique furniture sale, there were the Great Wallendas and escape artist Jon Oliver, trolley tours, and an expanded art market.

Bolstered by seasonable weather, attendance soared. Chamber of Commerce executive director Laurie Marrs put preliminary crowd estimates at 15,000-20,000, a 50-100 percent increase over last year's turnout. Some of

the booth operators ran out of food to sell hungry festival patrons, and we were short of Northville Record special supplements to pass out.

And why shouldn't the crowds be vast? Where else can you enjoy the picnic-like atmosphere of a community fair and see a Civil War regiment in full regalia? Where else can you push your face into a banana pie and attend a ball where everyone looks like Rhett Butler and Scarlett O'Hara?

It's a magnificent event of which this great community can be justly proud. All the many volunteers, clubs, sponsors and participating merchants should be congratulated for helping to pull off yet another successful Victorian Festival. The results made all the effort worthwhile.

The conversation turned to Dr. Jack Kevorkian, whose most recent assisted suicide (that he'll admit to) was with a Novi man, Thomas Hyde. I was interested to get Dad's perspective, not only as a professional, but as someone away from the media circus assisted suicides have generated here. (Our TV stations here in Detroit are regarded around the country as being among the worst offenders for such things. But I digress).

"Dr. Kevorkian is a man ahead of his time," my father said, to my surprise, and went on to outline just a few situations where he thought assisted suicide should be allowed.

For example, he cited dialysis patients over 60. Dialysis is the mechanical filtering process for treating persons whose kidneys have failed. Dialysis can continue for years, but at a certain point, the patient must be placed on the machine permanently, and becomes immobile. Sweden, Germany and Great Britain are just a few of the countries that will not allow persons over 60 to be treated by dialysis, and thus allow those persons to die.

He further pointed out that the Netherlands, just two or three years ago, adopted laws that allow physician-assisted suicides in some cases. There are 12 criteria that must be met unanimously, and at least two physicians must consult along with one family member, and the patient if he or she is

capable.

My Dad also said he's very comfortable with the finite nature of life. He referred to it as "recycling," saying that when his time comes to stand aside and make room for more people, he hopes he's "recycled" as gracefully as possible.

To me, my Dad was always the consummate professional, not one I pictured allying himself with a radical thinker like Kevorkian. But I began to believe that perhaps the contrast is not as great as I had thought.

My father hinted that some physicians are already "easing patients over the edge," though with less fanfare and somewhat less abruptly than Dr. Kevorkian. It works like this: someone who is near their end is treated with pain-relieving steroids, and perhaps morphine as the pain progresses. No other treatment is given for their ailment, and they are sent home to their families.

In most cases, the patient is visited by family members in the days preceding his or her death, and everyone is happy and at peace when the end comes. No one is jolted by the suddenness of the death, and no one bears the grief of thinking that they didn't get to see Uncle Joe before he went.

So, in a sense, assisted suicides are already going on. It takes a couple of weeks, instead of a few seconds on a carbon monoxide tank.

It's my guess that there are a lot of physicians who think the way my father does. On the surface, professional, and acting within legal bounds; but in private acknowledging that assisted suicide will see its time in this country.

What checks and balances are there on a newspaper?

Believe it or not, one of the best is the newspaper itself.

Anyone who thinks reporters and editors — yes, even executive editors — are all of the same mind on any given issue doesn't know much about how newspapers operate.

A case in point came up last week. Early in September, the Northville Board of Education ratified a new contract with its teachers' union. The contract called for the pay schedule to remain unchanged in 1993-94 and to increase 3 percent in 1994-95, the second year of the pact.

School officials, not to mention the teachers' union, I'm sure, were hoping for a headline that blared "Teachers accept pay freeze."

Most newspapers would have acceded. After all, if the contract doesn't move, it's a pay freeze, isn't it? Those would have been the words bandied about the school board's ratification meeting, and most newspapers would have picked them up and used them in their reports on the new contract.

We didn't. What we reported was that 30 percent of Northville teachers could see wage hikes of almost 9 percent in the first year of the contract.

How could that happen? How could some teachers see wage hikes of almost 9 percent when the contract calls for a "pay freeze?"

The answer, of course, is the increments. Teachers receive "increment increases" every year through their first 11 years of service. So, even if the contract is frozen, teachers with less than 11 years of service will continue to cash in on those incremental increases.

No where in our coverage of the new contract did we mention the words "pay freeze."

And that's where my checks and balances story comes in. "Don't you think we were a little tough in our coverage of the teacher contract?" I asked Mike Malott, managing editor of The Northville Record and The Novi News.

"I want us to be tough... I want us to report accurately on everything, particularly teacher contracts," I continued. "But don't you think we were a little tough by refusing to acknowledge that the teachers' union agreed to a 'pay freeze.' Let's be tough, but let's not be so tough that we can't give credit where credit is due."

And what ensued at that point was a discussion of whether or not we had been unfair to the Northville teachers by refusing to report that they had taken a "pay freeze."

Checks and balances in action. Questioning ourselves about our own accuracy and objectivity.

Frankly, Malott convinced me that we had reported accurately. What's more, he convinced me that reporting the story as I had suggested by calling it a "pay freeze" would have been inaccurate.

"But it wasn't a pay freeze," he argued.

"A 'pay freeze' means that nobody gets a pay raise. But the truth is that 30 percent of the teachers got raises this year, and some of those raises were as high as 9 percent — which is about three times as high as the private sector is doing this year.

"I'm sure they would have liked us to call it a freeze, but it wasn't," he added. "When 30 percent of the teachers are getting raises, you can't call it a pay freeze... because it isn't."

Malott stood fast on the position, and he was right. The best he could do in good conscience, he said, was call it a "pay slurpee," but even that would have been inaccurate.

## All's not well in California's wine country

A recent trip to California bore witness to the fact that all is not well in wine country — especially the Napa Valley.

The spread of phylloxera continues to play a pivotal role. Napa Valley winegrowers are in the early stages of replanting with new, phylloxera resistant rootstock — a most expensive undertaking that will continue until the year 2000.

It is estimated that over the next four to seven years, 50 percent of the valley's 34,000 vineyard acres will be replanted.

Current decline of Napa Valley vineyards (and others in California wine country) is caused by a strain of phylloxera that feeds on AxiR#1 rootstock. Approximately 50 percent of the vineyards in Napa Valley are currently planted on AxiR#1.

Only last year at this time, there were economic forecasts of a grape shortage beginning with the 1993 harvest. This has not come to pass. Recent record harvests and inaccuracy in assessing actual plantings have in fact created an oversupply of grapes causing a sea of wine, especially chardonnay, that has dropped from \$1,200 to \$800 per ton. Will the consumer see a drop in prices? Not for premium wines.

Remember, there will always be a shortage of grapes from the best vineyard sites. However, prices for premium and ultrapremium wines will stabilize.

Our prediction is that the consumer will witness heated competition among the fighting varietals. And this time, the fracas will include producers of these modestly-priced (\$5-\$8) bottlings from southern France, Chile and South Africa where wines have improved significantly over the last three years. There'll be plenty of quality, everyday drinking wine at some of the best prices ever.

While the Napa Valley realtor multitasker is nearly as thick as the area's Yellow Pages, many Napa Valley wineries are doing just fine, thank you, and that's the upside of the report.

One winery riding at the top of its game is Shafer Vineyards. The Shafers have begun replanting efforts while at the same time releasing some of winemaker Doug Shafer's best wines to date.

Released this month is Firebreak (\$19), a new wine in the Shafer stables. It is truly a smokin' and hot offering of 61 percent sanglovese and 39 percent cabernet sauvignon.

The Italian Super Tuscan blends set the style that is the new wave in California reds. Shafer's bottling is up to the competition in this category. The downside here is that this wine is in very limited quantity.

Also dynamite from Shafer is the 1990 Cabernet Sauvignon, Napa Valley, Stags Leap District (\$19). This focused, nearly seamless wine is complex and rich. Shafer 1991 Merlot (\$18) is power-packed in flavors with a seducing finish.

Coming soon to this market is Shafer's 1992 Chardonnay (\$15). Buy this one for winter drinking. You'll envision yourself in a tropical paradise.

When you purchase wines at this price, you want to make certain they fully complement the meal they accompany. Four sure-fire recipes tested in the Shafer kitchen follow inside.

Over the next several months, we'll be reviewing several California wineries and their wines. These producers are practicing their craft well and remain sound amid uncertain financial times.

## FIRE in the BOWL

### Chili cook set to go national

You'll have to forgive Jim Sgriccia if he's all fired up.

This longtime chili cook has demonstrated his ability by once again qualifying for worldwide competition with his sensational Day Later Chili. On Oct. 3, the Northville resident will travel to the International Chili Cookoff in Reno, Nev., at the Eldorado Hotel and Casino. Last year's finals in Scottsdale, Ariz., drew 125 cooks from all over the United States, as well as Europe and Japan.

To qualify for the world championship, a chili cook has to finish well in one of the many regional competitions. Each regional holds a handful of qualifiers per year. Sgriccia won the North Central Regional cookoff in Wayne last July, competing against 60 cooks from all the Great Lakes States, Illinois, Missouri, and even Canada.

It's not unusual for competitive chili cooks to travel hundreds of miles for a cookoff.

"Jerry Simmons is from Missouri, and I run into him all the time," Sgriccia said. "I know him better than most people that I live close to."

Sgriccia's winner, Day Later Chili, is a recipe he's used for years, although he tinkers with it constantly with the goal of improving it. Apparently the tinkering has paid off.

"I made some changes to the recipe I've been using," he said. "I was real happy. I was going to try out at The Lark (the Birmingham restaurant which annually hosts a sanctioned chili cookoff), too, but then I took first place at Wayne and won that big trophy."

The secret to Sgriccia's burgeoning success has been some intense study into the art and science of chili peppers. He did some reading in *The Chili Book* by Mark Miller, and then began sampling all the many varieties of dried chili peppers. To his surprise, he discovered that indeed there were discernible differences in the flavors of the various chilis. Sgriccia talked about them the way a connoisseur talks about wine.

"The chilis are all so subtle and different," he said. "You have to experiment to see what you like."

The chilis Sgriccia mixes into his chili powder are cascabel, mulato, pasilla, ancho, guajillo, and ordinary mild California chili. All of these chilis are all mild, and indeed three of them are used for the traditional Mexican mole. For heat, he cooks one teaspoon of chipotle chili powder in with the meat as he browns it. Chipotle rates high in Scoville units (the scientific measure of the hotness of a chili), but it's also got a unique smoky barbecue flavor that makes it irresistible.

Sgriccia keeps all of his chilis in marked plastic containers in the refrigerator. He'll mix and match powders when he cooks chili at home.

"I enjoy cooking, and I've always loved chili," he said. Sgriccia's other big secret is the one which gives Day Later Chili its name. He will brown the meat, cook the vegetables, and toss in all his spices. Then he'll let it all simmer for about an hour.

When all the flavors have mingled nicely, he'll pull the chili off the burner, and plunge the pot into a cooler full of ice. Later, when it's time to serve the chili he'll heat it back up again.

"I got the idea several years ago at a competition," Sgriccia said. "I got done cooking the chili, and I had an hour and a half until the judging, so I left it to cool down on ice. The result was Day Later Chili."

The rationale is obvious to anyone who's ever eaten leftover chili that's sat in the refrigerator overnight. Not only does it taste better, but the process of cooling and reheating the chili thickens it, an important criterion on which competitive chilis are judged.

For the uninitiated, cooking chili at home is one thing, but preparing it for competition is quite another. The International Chili Society has some clearly defined rules about what can go in the pot and what can't. No thickeners such as rice, pasta or beans are allowed. That's right. Competitive chili is served Texas style: no beans.

Competitive chili is also not supposed to be extremely hot. It should have fire, for sure, but not to the point where it's repulsive. Sgriccia points to the example of the 1991 International Chili Cookoff winner, Randy Robinson of Columbus, Ohio.

"I tried his chili, and it wasn't hot," he said. "It didn't

have a lot of fire, but I liked it."

With continued practice, Sgriccia hopes to create a chili that is as tomato-less as possible; just meat and sauce.

Competitive chili cooks don't need any special credentials, Sgriccia adds.

"Anybody can get in," Sgriccia said. "You just have to love chili, and be ready for disappointment."

Sgriccia knows about disappointment. Although he first started competing in 1984, he didn't get his first recognition, a fifth-place finish, until 1987. Before he even entered his first competition, he spent two years visiting chili cookoffs and sampling all the different chilis.

Over the years, he's won four cookoffs, and has taken a couple of seconds and a third. There have also been numerous top 10 finishes.

Though he competed as many as 20 times a year, Sgriccia has cut down to just four shows a year lately. He competes in Wayne, Windsor, Livonia and the competition at The Lark.

Jim Lark, owner of the Lark restaurant is a big chili fan himself. His goal is to one day host a cookoff of 40 chili cooks, all of them previous winners and thus international competitors. He's already got one in Jim Sgriccia.

"That was the dream when I started," he said. "Now I can't believe I'm going back again."

# California replants to save crop

Continued from 1

2 stalks celery, finely diced  
1 medium onion, finely diced  
1 tablespoon shallots, finely diced  
1 tablespoon olive oil  
1 cup red wine  
3 tablespoons red wine vinegar  
1 cup rich beef stock  
4 tablespoons hazelnuts, toasted, skinned and ground  
½ cup blackberries  
1 ounce blue cheese  
1 sprig fresh thyme  
2 tablespoons unsalted butter  
Salt and pepper to taste

Season loin and sear sides until brown. Place in roasting pan and into a 350 degree preheated oven. Using a roasting thermometer, roast until internal temperature is 160 degrees. Meanwhile, heat oil in a pan over a medium flame. Brown pork trimmings. Add carrots, celery, onions, shallots and thyme. When vegetables are translucent deglaze with vinegar and wine. Reduce to almost dry.

Add stock and reduce by ½ until it coats the backside of a spoon. Strain and add blackberries to warm. Blend blue cheese and butter together to a smooth consistency. Break cheese/butter mixture into very small pieces, and partially whisk into sauce. Slice roast thinly and place on plate, coat with sauce, top with chopped nuts. Serve with Roasted Garlic Mashed

Potatoes (recipe follows) and green or yellow vegetable.  
Complements Shafer Merlot.  
Yields 4-6 servings. Prep time: 1.5 hours.

## ROASTED GARLIC MASHED POTATOES

4-6 potatoes  
1 medium head garlic  
½ tablespoon olive oil  
Salt and white pepper to taste  
2 tablespoons butter  
½ cup milk

Slice off top of garlic. Pour olive oil into opening and wrap in foil. Place garlic into 350 degree oven for 30-45 minutes until soft. Remove from oven and allow to cool. Squeeze out garlic cloves. Remove any skins. Mash into a smooth paste.

Bring 3-4 quarts of salted water to a boil. Peel potatoes and cube ½ -inch. Add potatoes to boiling water and cook until soft (approximately 10 minutes).

Drain and place in bowl with garlic and remaining ingredients. Mash until well incorporated and smooth. Serve with Roasted Pork Loin. Yield 4 servings. Prep time 30 minutes.

## VEAL CHOPS WITH RAGOUT OF MUSHROOMS

8 ½ -inch thick veal chops

½ -pound shiitake mushrooms, sliced  
½ -pound brown mushrooms, sliced  
1 medium shallot, finely minced  
1 clove garlic, finely minced  
¾ cup red wine  
1 tablespoon red wine vinegar  
2 tablespoons olive oil  
1 cup beef stock  
2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce  
Salt and freshly ground black pepper to taste

Salt and pepper veal chops and set aside. Heat oil in pan. Sauté mushrooms and add shallots and garlic. Deglaze with red wine and red wine vinegar. Reduce to almost dry. Add stock and Worcestershire sauce, reduce by half or until a thick consistency. Salt and pepper to taste. Set aside.

Heat oil in oven-proof pan. Sauté veal chops until nicely browned. Finish in 350 degree oven for approximately 10 minutes. Place veal chops on a bed of mushroom ragout and serve with roasted garlic mashed potatoes and seasonal vegetables.

Complements Shafer Cabernet Sauvignon. Yields 4 servings. Prep time: 45 min. to 1 hour

## APPLE-LEEK TART COMPLEMENTS

One 9-inch pie crust

3-4 apples, green and red (Granny Smith and Red Delicious)  
4 medium leeks  
1 tablespoon unsalted butter  
½ cup walnuts, toasted/rough chop  
2 ounces Havarti cheese  
¼ teaspoon salt  
¼ teaspoon white pepper  
nutmeg to taste  
1 lemon, juiced

Remove green from leeks, slice, rinse well and dice ¼ -inch. Core apples and cut in half. Dice one of the green apple halves ¼ -inch and add to leeks. Melt butter in skillet and sauté leeks and diced apples. When apples and leeks are soft, season with salt and white pepper. Add pinch of nutmeg and reserve leek mixture. Slice apples ¼ -inch thick across. Coat slices with lemon juice.

In tart shell, arrange apple slices in rows standing up 1-inch apart. Between rows fill half-way with leek mixture. Sprinkle lightly with ½ walnuts and cheese. Cover with remaining leek mixture making sure the rows of apples are still showing. Top with remaining walnuts and cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes or until apples are soft. Let set for 5-10 minutes, serve warm.

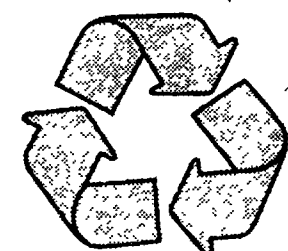

# Tidbits help the fight against cancer

Here are some nutritional nuggets of information from Karen Collins, registered dietitian for the American Institute for Cancer Research in Washington, D.C.

● **Egg whites** are a good source of low-fat protein. However, the yolk is actually the portion of the egg that contains the majority of the iron, zinc, vitamin B-12, and folacin (a B vitamin). If your diet is well-balanced this may not be a problem. Another

alternative is to prepare eggs using some whole eggs and some egg whites. When using eggs in cooking, you might cut fat content with fewer nutrient losses by using whole eggs and cutting the amount of added fat by a quarter to a third. Cutting back on fatty meats such as bacon or sausage served with eggs and switching to leaner foods elsewhere in the day's diet can also cut significant fat without any loss in nutrients.

● Ever wonder how long it's safe to

keep a "doggy bag" of leftovers from a restaurant before getting them home to refrigerate? Food should not be kept at room temperature any longer than two hours from the time that it is served. If you are going to a show after dinner, or are running errands, it is probably better not to take a doggy bag than to risk getting food poisoning when you eat those leftovers. You cannot judge the safety of that doggy bag's contents by looks, smell or taste.



● Professional chefs' use of flowers such as nasturtiums and marigolds is generally safe. However, if you are uncertain, err on the safe side and don't eat flower petals or other ingredients or garnishes you are unsure of in restaurants. And don't experiment haphazardly with different flowers at home. Some flowers can cause toxic reactions.

The safety of flowers may also depend on how they are grown.

# 'L.A. Law' gets back to basics for eighth season on NBC

This time last year, it looked as if "L.A. Law" didn't have a prayer—so it makes a kind of perverse sense that returning producer William M. Finkelstein is looking to a new character described as "a non-judgmental fundamentalist Christian" to shake things up this year on the series. The much-Emmyed drama begins its eighth season Thursday, Oct. 7, on NBC.

Norman Lear's short-lived 1991 sitcom "Sunday Dinner" marked the last time TV attempted to deal with a person's religious faith as an ongoing topic. "Sunday" lasted barely a month, but Finkelstein sees young associate Jane Halliday (Alexandra Powers of "Rising Sun") as a source of many new story lines on a series that was being pronounced brain-dead before his return to the helm last spring.

"She's a fundamentalist Christian working in a secular environment," he emphasizes during a phone interview. "Her primary function there is to be an attorney, not a missionary. There will be many situations in which her religion will be an element in the drama, or the conflict,

of the story—but not always."

Finkelstein readily acknowledges that so-called "watchdog groups," such as Donald Wildmon's American Family Association, are quick to jump on controversial targets without even experiencing them, but says he has received no adverse attention about the new character.

"I gather that, to the extent they're interested, they're taking a wait-and-see attitude," he says. "As much as I usually find myself in complete disagreement with what those groups stand for, I think one thing they are not incorrect about is that, when religion is portrayed on television, it has always been portrayed as a bizarre or comical condition. People are never shown as being religious who are, for all other purposes, normal."

One series regular in particular will benefit from the introduction of this new character, Finkelstein says: developmentally disabled Benny Stulwicz, played by back-to-back Emmy-winner Larry Drake. "(Suddenly) there's a woman of great religious faith," the producer points out. "What does Benny think of that? What is Benny's notion of God

and Christ...? How does that figure in? That right there is something that we've never seen and we can organically develop within the body of the show, without straining to tell it. I mean, the story is there to be told."

Finkelstein, who co-produced "Law" during its 1988-90 glory days, returned last spring after his highly regarded but low-rated ABC drama "Civil Wars" was not renewed. "Wars" cast members Alan Rosenberg (who plays Eli Rosenberg) and Debi Mazar (Denise Ian-nello) reprise their characters on "L.A. Law" this season. Eli, as it turns out, is a cousin of Stuart Markowitz (Michael Tucker), Finkelstein says, adding that the relationship between Stuart and Ann Kelsey (Jill Eikenberry) is a priority for him this season. He agrees that this once-vital couple became trapped in soap-operatics last season.

"I am making every effort to both normalize them as attorneys and to put them back on sound footing as a married couple," he says of the married-in-real-life pair who stole the anticipated sexual thunder from Harry Hamlin and Susan Dey, starting with the show's premiere in 1986. "Jill and Michael are very, very important elements of this show. What I like to see is (their characters) being supportive of one another. I think they were drawn as that kind of couple. There was a very real chemistry between them, right from the very first show."

"One of the real strengths the show had was the way they were with one another. I don't think that should be disrupted, quite frankly. There's a lot of turmoil on the show. Every week, it's someone else's tragedy, someone else's conflict. I think it's important to go to that which is not rent asunder."

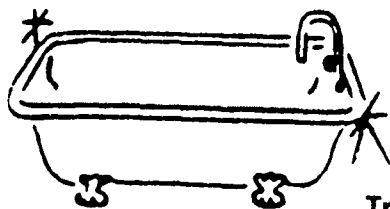

The development doesn't please her greedy half-siblings, who expected the inheritance to be theirs.

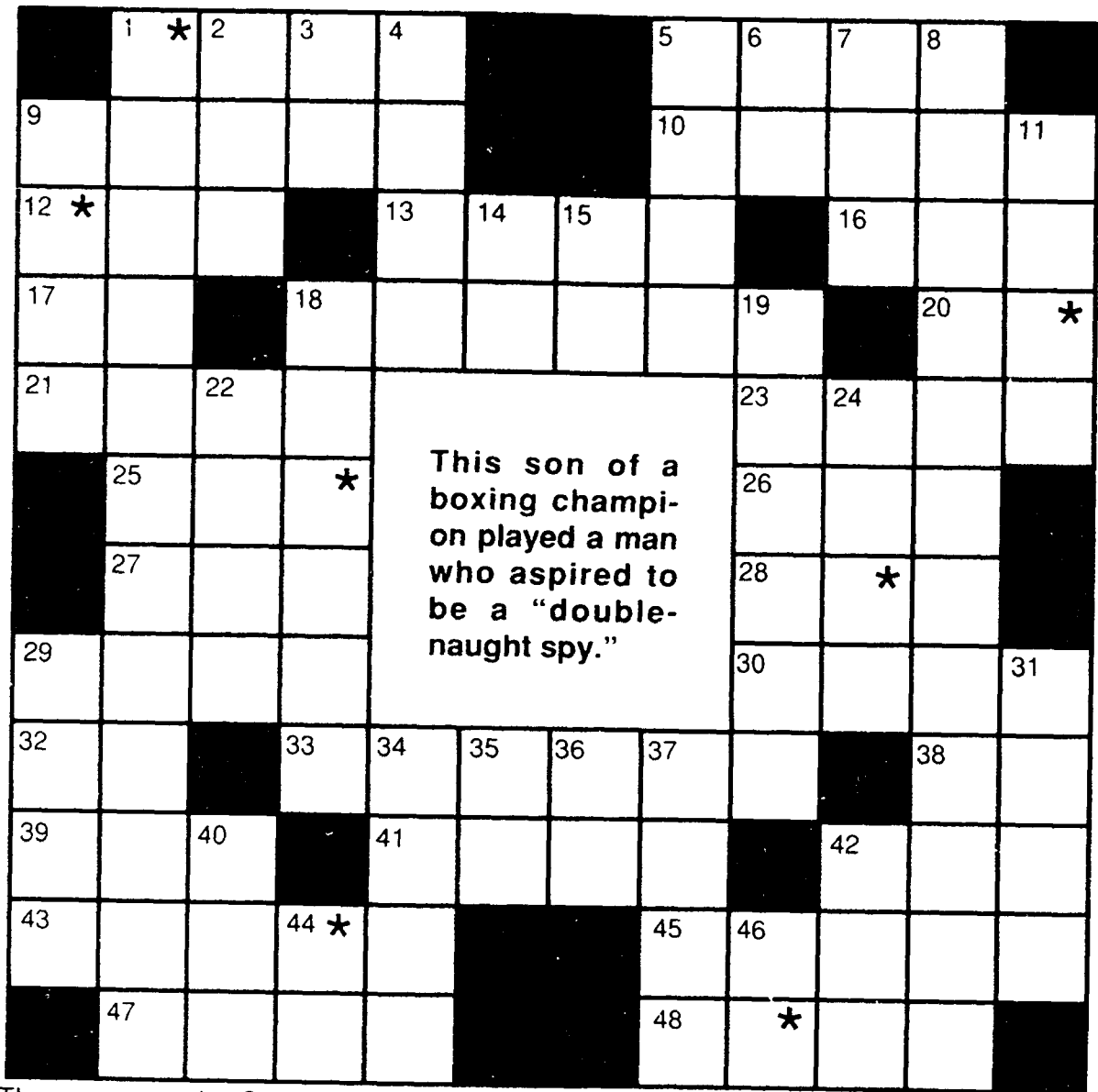
"My siblings are narrow-minded and focused on money," she says. "This show is very well written, and I think it will give people a look at the good and bad sides of being a rich family."
