

Twp. refunds will represent 6 figure outlay

Northville Township Trustees will spend an estimated \$140,000 to refund flat-rate sewer customers for nearly a decade of overbillings.

The board voted 5-2 Thursday night to refund the principal and interest earned on the money 200 flat-rate sewer customers have paid to the township since 1984.

Treasurer Rick Engelland and Trustee Gini Britton voted against Barbara O'Brien's motion because neither thought the township should pay interest on the principal.

The overbillings stem from a 1984 board of trustees decision to give flat

rate sewer customers a break, estimating its sewage level at 150,000 gallons, down from 200,000. At that time, the board voted to lower the rate at the recommendation of Wayne County, but the rate reduction was never implemented or executed by the staff.

For nearly 10 years, Northville Township has billed 200 flat-rate sewer customers for sewer usage based on a 200,000 gallons per year rate — even though the township only paid Wayne County for 150,000 gallons.

The surplus from the overpayments has been deposited into the

Questions about Mainstreet '93 raised at session

A resurrected Mainstreet '93 proposal drew an hour's worth of questions from Northville city planners and interested citizens at its unveiling last week.

The Northville City Council hosted a special Wednesday night joint meeting of the city's planning commission, downtown development authority (DDA), citizen's district council, historic district commission

(HDC) and chamber of commerce board of directors to give the various groups a first glimpse of the new proposal.

The two-deck plan, to be funded by a \$3.8 million, 15-year bond issue, now goes to most of the groups individually as it winds its way through the city approval process.

At Wednesday's meeting, most of the questions revolved around the reconfigured design for a new parking

The entire group grows together through triumph and tragedy, with laughter and heartbreak.

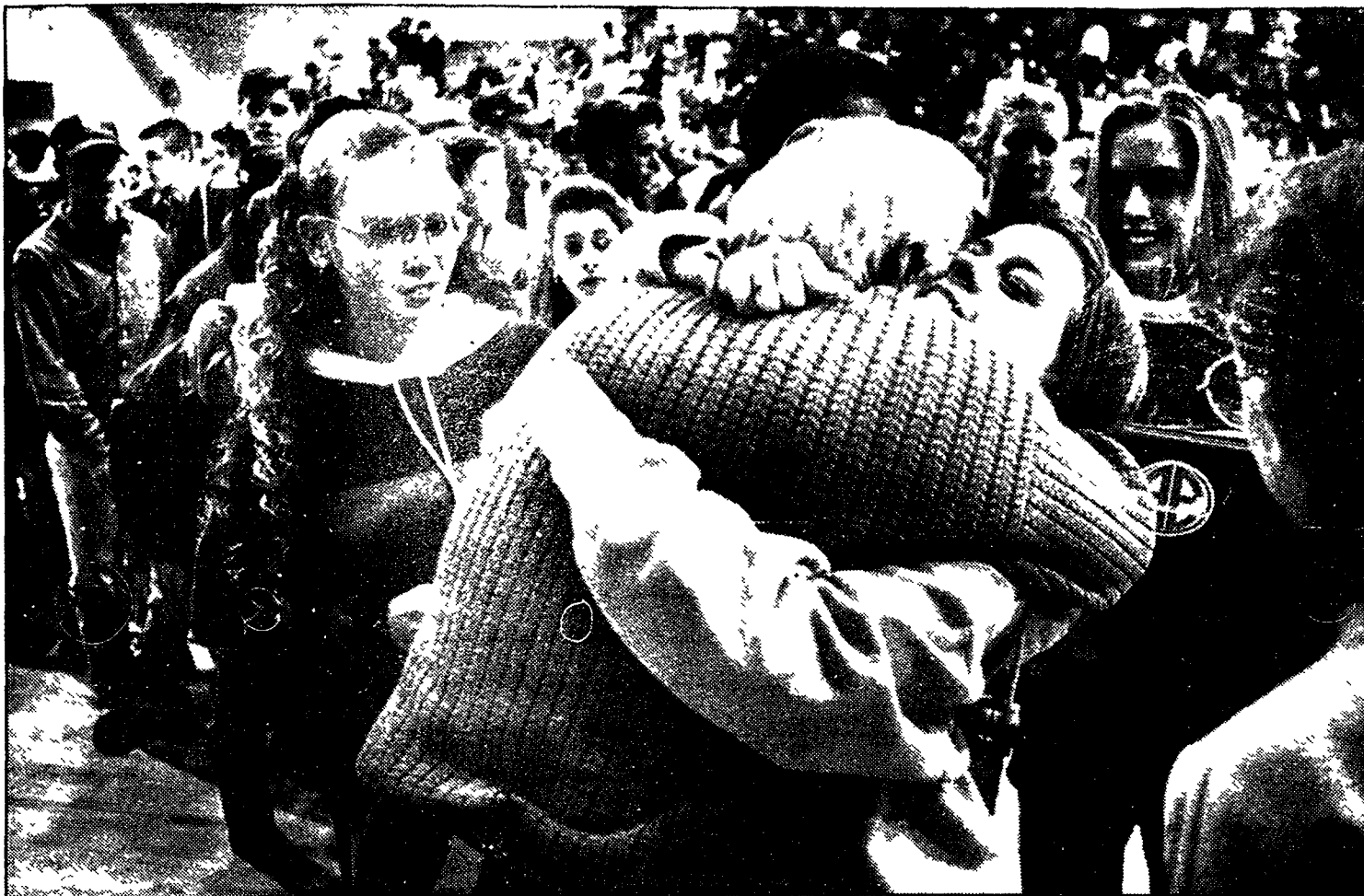
Portraying Dr. Swinford is Mike Fenlauer. Other students are played

Speaker seeks to heal rifts at high school

Northville High School Principal Thomas Johnson fears the media are on the wrong track with the attention they've given the school lately about cultural tensions.

"This has been derailed by the media," Johnson said, referring to a *Detroit News* article that appeared last Tuesday. The article suggested the school was responding to an assault between a black male student and a white female student by holding forums on racial and cultural intolerances that have been occurring at the school.

"The DeVaughn and Nicole thing had nothing to do with the programs we are putting in place," Johnson said.

DeVaughn Little, 17, was arrested after pushing 16-year-old Nicole LaLonde into a wire-reinforced window at the high school Sept. 30. Witnesses said LaLonde slapped Little and he pushed her into a window, briefly knocking her unconscious.

Johnson said staff planned programs to instill more student respect and tolerance of different values during a school improvement session held in June. Speaker Jim Tuman, director of the Royal Oak-based Positive School Support Program, was scheduled to speak at the school before the assault incident took place.

"We planned those things because we didn't feel we did enough cultural things," Johnson said.

One idea was to plan a celebration for Martin Luther King Jr.'s birthday in January.

"We don't want the black students to feel separated, but to feel just as much a part of the entire student body," Johnson said. "That goes for the Asians, too."

Programs proactive in war against drugs

Editor's note: This is the second in a series of articles examining the incidence of drug and alcohol use among Northville-area youths. The first story looked at the efforts of the Student Assistance and Northville Youth Assistance programs. This installment focuses on the Northville Action Council and Community Commission on Drug Abuse (CCODA).

Joining the fight against drug and alcohol use among Northville teenagers are the Northville Action Council and Community Commission on Drug Abuse (CCODA).

Now about 5 years old, the Northville Action Council (NAC) has a history of stepping aside and letting others take over after starting major projects dealing with drug and alcohol abuse awareness. Take the annual Red Ribbon campaign, for instance. The popular substance abuse

campaign, which has become a tradition celebrated in the schools in March, was the brain child of the NAC. Now, however, the PTA will be overseeing red ribbon activities.

"The PTA has taken a vested interest in the program since it became a national PTA substance awareness campaign," Roxanne Casterline, a member of the NAC, said. "Now it's in their hands."

NAC still contributes to the red ribbon campaign, holding a pie sale in October as a fund raiser.

Actually, NAC members prefer the view from the sidelines. By the time they start a project, see it through to success and turn it over to another group, NAC members are already planning their next endeavor.

Sometimes those endeavors may be to help finance a project.

"If programs such as Student Assistance have goals they want to obtain or reach, we'll help them find the funds to support them in the community to carry through on those goals," Casterline said.

"There's always some need in the community," Maureen D'Avanzo said. "We try to stay focused on only a couple things at one time."

In the past, NAC fund-raisers have benefited Students Against Driving Drunk (SADD) chapters, teen dances and Student Assistance.

The NAC was created by former Northville High School principal David Bolitho. Bolitho is now the district's assistant superintendent for administrative services.

"It was a bunch of parents who got together, going through needs of their own who wanted to have a greater understanding of what was going on and what the kids were participating in," Casterline said.

The NAC is probably best known for its Safe Homes, a program which offers a directory listing numbers of residents pledging not to allow substance abuse in their homes. The group's big project now is developing a teen center.

"At this point we're doing a lot of research in the community now to establish a permanent teen center," D'Avanzo said.

There are six members of the NAC who are now involved in the community task force of the Northville Youth Forum to make the teen center a reality in Northville.

"I really think (a teen center is) going to happen," Casterline said.

"Once we find a place we'll start an all-out fund raiser," D'Avanzo added.

The NAC meets at 7 p.m. on the third Thursday of each month at city hall. New members are welcome. For further information, call 349-3291.

Although the Community Commission on Drug Abuse (CCODA) has been around for 23 years, the Northville location opened its doors downtown four years ago.

According to Dr. John Farar,

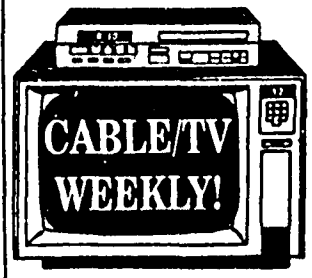

Township to refund sewer users for overcharges

township's water and sewer accounts, and, according to Finance Director Dwayne Harrigan, that's where the refunds will be withdrawn from too.

About 25 residents from the Edenderry subdivision and from homes adjacent to that Seven Mile neighborhood came to Thursday's meeting to see what action the board was going to take to remedy the situation.

They had little to say once the issue came up for discussion.

After Township Manager Bill Richards reiterated the township attor-

ney's opinion that residents would win a lawsuit filed against the township if the board didn't provide the refunds, O'Brien, an Edenderry resident, asked for action on the issue.

"This isn't a gain by anybody," O'Brien said about the refunds. "It is just money that people were overcharged."

After several trustees questioned the timing of the issue and their readiness to vote on the issue, O'Brien spelled out what she believes is the most equitable solution.

"It's very simple," she said. "You know how much they overpaid, pay them back."

Even though he voted against paying back interest, Engelland thought current customers were entitled to a refund. He then suggested the township create a policy to handle claims from previous flat-rate sewer customers.

"I believe we should immediately take the steps to provide refunds for all of the current customers for over payment and then set a policy for other customers' claims," he said.

Richards and Township Supervisor Karen Baja agreed a mechanism was needed to handle claims from previous customers along with a statute of limitations for claims made to

the township for reimbursement in the future.

Prior to the board's decision, the two tried to suggest alternatives to refunds. Richards suggested the board survey customers' interest in getting refunds or credits on their sewer bills. He also suggested the township could waive the plumbing fees and cut the costs of installing meters.

None of those ideas took root with trustees.

Engelland and Britton both conceded that if the residents wanted the refunds then it was in the township's best interest to provide them as soon as possible.

"Why take the extra step," Engelland said about Richards' idea to survey residents. "Let's just go ahead and cut the checks and get it out of here before Christmas."

"I'm not sure we can afford to give refunds," Britton said, "but if we have to, I think we should do it as soon as possible. But I don't think we should give interest."

O'Brien was also seeking to eliminate the need for flat-rate fees by installing meters. She said having meters installed would eliminate the ongoing dispute between actual and estimated sewer usage. But the installation of meters was

also a bone of contention that has yet to be decided. Township Clerk Sue Hillebrand said she was opposed to having meters installed for flat-rate sewer customers and not for all township water and sewer customers.

"It's typically not a good thing," she said. "... and I would want the same option at my house. And we would need to allow all residents the same opportunity."

Even though the clerk voted for the refunds, she said the move would cause the township a hardship.

"We are cash strapped," she said. "It will be difficult to expend that amount of money to refund everyone."

Police News

Four youths found on roof of Marquis Theatre

City police nabbed four Northville youths for trespassing atop the Marquis Theatre Nov. 8. The youths were spotted on the roof of the several-story building at 133 E. Main St. around 10 p.m., and ordered to come down before the fire department was sent in with a ladder truck. The youths — three of them 14 years old and one 13 — were turned over to their parents.

AIR COMPRESSOR STOLEN: A Dayton air compressor valued at \$900 was reported stolen from the back of a pickup truck parked in the rear lot at McDonald Ford, 550 W. Seven Mile Road. The compressor was described as a red and grey 8-hp gasoline-powered model with two 70-pound tanks, weighing about 200 pounds. It was taken sometime between 6 p.m. Nov. 8 and 11:30 a.m. Nov. 11.

ASSAULT AT HAWTHORNE CENTER: A nurse at the Hawthorne Center, 18471 Haggerty Road, reported an assault which took place

on Nov. 1 at 8:15 p.m. According to Michigan State Police reports, the woman claimed a 14-year-old resident of the center became agitated and uncontrollable. As she and another staffer escorted the boy to a quiet room, the boy grabbed her by the back of hair and shook her, causing strain on the nurse's neck. He was subdued by staffers. The case remains open pending an interview with the suspect and his parents. The case will then be submitted to the Wayne County Prosecutor's office, but will likely be handled internally, police said.

STOLEN ALARM: The owner of a 1993 Honda motorcycle told police a neighbor in his condominium complex ripped a \$60 portable, motion detector alarm off his cycle. The complainant told township police he asked an elderly gentleman living in the same building if he had any knowledge about the damage done to his cycle. The cycle owner said the man admitted to him that he had vandalized the bike.

"Yeah, I took it off and stomped on it," the complainant told police his neighbor said. The two exchanged words in a heated argument before the suspect left the area. The bike owner called police and filed a complaint against the man.

DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE: A 25-year-old Waterford man was arrested for driving under the influence after township police stopped the man for a loud muffler on Thursday, Nov. 11. Police stopped the man on Seven Mile Road near Pierson Road. But when police approached

the car they smelled a strong odor of intoxicants coming from inside the car. The officer arrested the man who at first refused to take a Breathalyzer test. He was taken back to the station where he later agreed to take the test. Police recorded the man's blood alcohol level at .11 percent. After he sobered up the man was released on a \$100 cash bond.

FOUND PURSE: After repeated unsuccessful attempts to locate the owner of a lost purse, a 25-year-old man brought the purse to township police on Nov. 11. The man said he

found the Merona purse and its contents in the bed of his pickup truck. He said he tried to turn the purse in to the Oakland County's Sheriff's Department and to the Michigan State Police post, but neither would accept it. The purse contained several credit cards.

CITIZEN'S ARREST AT MEIJER: Township police arrested two women from Detroit on Thursday, Nov. 11, at Meijer for assaulting a store employee and stealing \$205.40 worth of makeup and clothing. After the two women, ages 18 and

20, were caught by store detectives stealing the merchandise, one poked a store employee in the chest with her forearm and then pushed the employee five to six feet down a hallway. The pair was ticketed for larceny. One faces additional assault and battery charges.

Deck revisions examined at session

structure south of the MainCentre building. The latest design calls for a sunken structure in which the upper level is parallel with the north end of the site and the lower level is built into the ground, similar to the existing Cady Street deck. The design eliminates the need for a ramp to access the upper level, and allows the lower level to be accessed from the south where the ground slopes down.

Access to the lower level would be restricted, with 76 of the 92 spaces reserved for MainCentre residents to fulfill the city's longstanding contractual obligation to Singh Development, builders of the MainCentre project. A stair and elevator tower at the north end of the lower level would carry those residents up to an enclosed pedestrian bridge that enters MainCentre.

The design was changed after Michigan Association of Gift Sales officials threatened to vacate their building rather than put up with a tabletop deck that sat astride the parking lot to their south.

What concerned most of the critics at Wednesday's meeting was the new design's placement, along the east edge of the parking lot south of MainCentre on what some consider prime land for future commercial development.

"If we build this, we've got a parking structure on a main thoroughfare and have lost an opportunity to ex-

pand the city," said DDA member Jim Long.

Planning Commission Chairman John Hardin agreed, and added that the deck's placement was not aesthetically pleasing given that Center Street is the route by which many people drive into the city.

"Is that the image that you want to project in the coming years," he asked.

Mayor Chris Johnson argued that commercial development on the lot south of MainCentre was unlikely since any developer would have to replace the parking lot as well as provide enough additional parking to meet its own needs.

Others questioned the design of the new structures, which use brick extensively and play off architectural elements in the MainCentre building. HDC member Fran Gazlay criticized the design of the brick-in pedestrian bridge, saying "It looks like a General Motors overpass to a bad parking lot."

Other portions of the Mainstreet '93 plan remain unchanged and drew fewer comments than the MainCentre structure. The plan still calls for a reconstructed Cady Street parking deck providing 181 spaces and an additional 13 spaces along Mary Alexander Court, and a lighted, paved 140- to 160-space parking lot along the south side of Cady Street.

City Manager Gary Word admitted that Mainstreet '93 was "a compromised plan," arrived at to take into ac-

count the city's financial condition after the \$6.2-million Mainstreet '92 plan for a greatly-expanded Cady Street deck was judged unfeasible. But the plan does allow for the reconstructed Cady deck to be expanded into the Mainstreet '92 structure in the future, by adding on to the south, and building up to two additional floors.

Word argued that the city must proceed now while interest rates and construction costs are still low. "We simply can't afford to wait much longer," he said.

Assuming that Mainstreet '93 wins approval from the planning commission, DDA and HDC, city officials hope to bid the project this year and start construction next spring. While Mainstreet '92 had been envisioned as a phased project to minimize the disruption to existing parking lots, tentative plans call for the various elements of Mainstreet '93 to be built at the same time to minimize the time that the construction is under way.

"Let's just get in, get it done and get out of there without dragging it on," Johnson said.

Parking Consultant Matt Jobim estimated that some new parking would be available within five months of the start of construction, and the whole project would be completed before the 1994 Christmas shopping season.

The last Mainstreet '93 plan was shelved when the state did away with

school funding by property taxes in July. Most of Mainstreet's funding was to come from tax capturing, the diversion of property tax increases from the city's Downtown Development District to pay off the bonds that fund the project. Since about half the property taxes collected by the city have gone to Northville Public Schools, the state's action effectively cut that revenue stream in half.

What makes the new Mainstreet '93 financing plan possible is a lower cost (\$3.8 million compared to \$4.2 million in the last plan), longer tax capturing and financing periods (15 years as compared to 11 years), and the fact that the city no longer has to revert a third of the captured taxes to other taxing units like Northville Public Schools. The \$76,000 in tax capturing that would revert to Northville City each year would be pumped back into the project, for a total of \$1.2 million in city contributions over the 15-year life of the plan. Because the funds come from tax capturing, they will not cost the city directly.

The special assessments on downtown businesses remain unchanged. Singh will pay an additional \$589,407 in previously agreed-upon parking assessments to cover its MainCentre and proposed CadyCentre buildings, over and above its contribution to the special assessment roll.

Programs take aim at teen drug abuse

families in its three treatment centers (the other two are located in Livonia and Westland). The other involves prevention and educating the community about substance abuse.

CCODA has also had a hand in helping Northville Youth Forum's search for a teen center and supported the Northville Action Council's Safe Homes program.

"We try to find different aspects in what we can do to bring about an environmental change (to) have less of a problem rather than dealing with people where they already have a problem," Farrar said.

The counselor said even though businesses and schools have stepped up teaching efforts regarding substance abuse, parents are lagging behind in the lesson.

"Years ago when there was a problem with chemical dependency, the boss didn't do anything about it," Farrar said. "They figured what the guy did on his own time was his business. Schools, historically, didn't do anything about it. Now we have guys like Charlie Stillec up there and a curriculum (dealing with substance abuse). The piece I see as society dropping the ball is what the pa-

rents do, or don't do."

Farrar said the problem isn't unique to Northville, and called most parents "slow learners."

"Parents are either blind to what's going on or they are criminally permissive when it comes to this topic," he said. "... Kids don't get high in school as much as they did. They don't get drunk in school."

The three places where those activities are most likely to take place are at home, at a friend's home or in a car, Farrar said.

As a father to two teen-agers himself, Farrar said he's knows it isn't always easy to parent a teen.

"But you have to know what your kids are doing," he advised.

Too many parents want to be their child's friends and consequently, let them do what they want, Farrar added.

"Kids coming from the poor, more unstable environments suffer from neglect. Kids from the more affluent environments suffer from permissiveness."

There are all sorts of resources available, however, parents must be willing to use them, he said.

You just can't keep a good plan down

If nothing else, city officials have earned high marks for persistence.

After seeing dozens of different designs and financing plans shot down by local protest or state legislation, city staff members have floated a new version of their proposed Mainstreet '78 extension.

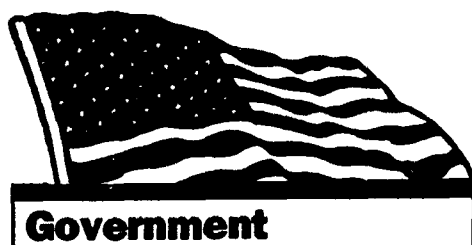
The latest \$3.8 million plan, to construct two parking decks and a lighted, paved parking lot in downtown Northville, is the end result of five years of attempts by the city to increase available parking for current and future commercial use. Last July, on the eve of approval by city voters, Mainstreet '93's financial forecasts were rendered meaningless and the plan was shelved along with dozens of other tax-capturing projects across Michigan when the state ended property-tax-funded school financing.

Now, barely four months later, city staff have drawn up a new financing blueprint — Version 35-B — that accounts for the loss of tax capturing from school property taxes. This time, the city is taking no chances that state actions could derail the concept.

As usual, the financial plan is based on very conservative estimates of city growth and a worst-case-scenario regarding state actions, taking into account the possibility of the state doing away with personal property tax revenues for cities. In Northville, the loss of personal property tax revenue would cut the amount of taxes that could be captured by more than half.

That loss is built into the current financial plan and will remain in place until the city hears differently. According to Finance Director Mark Christiansen, if the state leaves personal property taxes intact, the 15-year project could be paid off in 10 or 11 years instead.

The latest version also takes into account harsh criticism of the original Mainstreet '93 program by the Michigan Association of Gift Sales, which threatened to up and leave the city if it was forced to look out upon a tabletop parking deck that blocked the view of its building from the south and took up ad-



ditional public parking spaces. While MAGS' arguments were not entirely valid, the city took them to heart and designed the latest deck into the ground and along the east side of the lot to minimize the impact on MAGS.

The plan may be less attractive to the Singh Development Co., builders of MainCentre, since the deck is now entirely in front of their structure and their residents would have to enter the deck from the south end and use an elevator to get to their building. But Singh officials—who have waited five years for the covered parking they were promised by the city—have been incredibly patient with the city so far, and their patience shows no sign of waning at this point.

While final design details still need to be worked out, the plan seems a sensible method of providing the maximum number of new parking spaces and fulfilling the city's longstanding promise to provide MainCentre with 76 covered parking spaces, at a minimum cost. While it does not provide for the future as Mainstreet '92's multi-level ramped Cady Street parking deck did, it allows a rebuilt Cady Street deck to be transformed into the Mainstreet '92 model when the city can "afford it."

City Manager Gary Word called Mainstreet '93 a "compromised" plan at its reintroduction Wednesday. Though the proposal is the result of dozens of compromises, those that have been made so far have been necessary and have succeeded in producing a plan that responds to the city's current parking needs while providing for expansion in the future.

Budget hearings were opportunities for input

The process that culminated in the adoption of Northville Township's operating budget Nov. 1 came under criticism from individuals claiming the procedure didn't allow for adequate public comment.

The dissent came mostly from officials of the four shared services who objected to a proposal to freeze township allocations for the library, the senior center, Northville Youth Assistance and the recreation department.

While it's apparent the budget procedure was somewhat awkward and could benefit from fine tuning, we think on balance the process can be seen to have worked. In the end, shared services advocates were able to make their voices heard in public forums, and trustees wisely responded by approving increases in the township's allotment for the four funds.

What, more than anything else, enabled the procedure to succeed was the open nature of the meetings the Budget Review Committee held. The committee—consisting of the treasurer, the manager, the finance director and two community-at-large members—held open sessions with department heads to discuss proposed funding levels.

The meetings were attended by the beat reporter of this newspaper, who kept the community updated on changes in budget figures as they occurred. Residents, too, had the opportunity to attend.

Moreover, the recommendation from the Budget Review Committee was available for public perusal Oct. 25, and public hearings were held Oct. 28 and Nov. 1.

Things did go down to the wire when the second and final public hearing was held only 30 minutes before trustees convened the meeting at which the budget was to be approved. The financial plan had to be adopted that night in order to meet a state deadline; the township's fiscal year exactly parallels the calendar year, Jan. 1-Dec. 31.

In spite of the tight timing of the vote, however, and the near-scare shared services boosters received, the financial document seems to have come together in good order.

For the future, we would recommend that the Budget Review Committee meetings be kept open and that the final public hearing be held prior to the date of final passage. But, on the whole, we feel the procedure represented a good example of democracy in action.

Selling papers in suburbs

It amazes me the lengths to which the Detroit dailies will go to sell newspapers in the suburbs.

To read them, you'd think that Northville High School was a racial powderkeg with the lid ready to blow off. I'm sorry, but I've been to Willow Run, and I had a friend who taught in Southfield. Racial tension in Northville? I ain't buyin' it.

What happened between DeVaughn Little and Nicole LaLonde was a personality conflict, not a racial one. It could have happened anywhere. Feel free to mix and match the colors and creeds. What the *Detroit News* printed about it was misleading and inflammatory. The paper left out key details, and downplayed others to create a racially charged story where none existed.

I find it ironic that, despite nearly a month to work on it, *Detroit News* staffers couldn't gather all the facts.

First I'll gloat and tell you that we had the story straight the same week it happened. Then I'll tell you that the *Detroit News* tried to paint LaLonde as the aggressor by saying that she slapped Little, practically forcing him to hurl her through a reinforced glass window, knocking her unconscious.

The *Detroit News* ignored the fact that Little, no stranger to local law enforcement agencies, was taunting and jostling underclassmen (apparently not for the first time, we're told). LaLonde protested vocally, and Little responded with physi-

cal violence. He shoved his way through a crowd to get to her, then pinned her against a wall with her feet off the ground.

She slapped him to get away, and he responded by tossing her into the window.

The *Detroit News* then downplayed LaLonde's injuries saying she had no "visible" trauma, and called her concussion "mild" (which, among head injury professionals, is the equivalent of a mild case of pregnancy).

In the aftermath, the facts got even more wild and loose.

Detroit News reporters conducted a half-hour interview with one black student, and the only quote they printed from it said, yes, she has felt uncomfortable for racial reasons. She told them at length that Northville schools had made a commitment to resolving what little problems existed. Those comments never made it into print.

I'm on principal Thomas Johnson's side. Northville is getting a bad rap.

Conflict makes good reading; even we at this paper know that. But there are ethical limits. Trumping up racial conflict is like shooting fish in a barrel. I was a reporter for my college paper where there was a standing order to print any wire story from anywhere in the world that mentioned racial tension or conflict.

Perhaps the Detroit media lost its best race-baiter when Coleman Young's health started failing. Now, to make up for what they're lacking, the dailies are trying to find new Don Quixotes to send charging at the windmills.

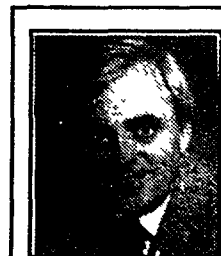

The MEA's still rolling along

Gil DiNello, the Republican state senator from Macomb County, was bashing the good old Michigan Education Association (MEA) pretty heavily on radio recently.

First of all, I caught one of those MEA commercials on television that gail me so much. You know the ones. They push a teacher—usually a pretty good teacher—in front of everyone and then get him or her to tell you how bad Gov. Engler's tax proposals are for kids... when, in fact, what the MEA is really worried about is higher salaries for teachers.

Let's face it. The MEA has demonstrated time and time again that when it comes down to salaries or student welfare, they come down firmly on the side of their own salaries.

The second thing was a story in the Nov. 1 edition of *The Rochester Eccentric*. Here's what it said:

"First there came pay-to-play. Then came pay-to-hold-after-school-PTA enrichment-classes-in-school."

"Now Rochester Community Schools officials are thinking about charging for graduation ceremonies... to keep its bottom line in the black this year."

I'm not making this up, folks. It's true. The Rochester school district is really considering the possibility of charging for graduation ceremonies.

And in the meantime, teacher salaries keep right on rising. And the MEA keeps trotting out teachers to tell you how evil Gov. Engler is for trying to come to grips with the problems of funding education.

And, once again, I'm disgusted. Asking students to pay to participate in extracurricular activities is onerous enough. But asking students to pay for graduation ceremonies defies imagination.

Johnson criticizes news reports of school efforts to ease student tensions

Other ideas that were kicked around were student exchange programs with other schools, student peer counseling and developing a steering committee to include members of the community, churches, businesses and civic groups to oversee it all. Johnson said he plans to have the steering committee in place before the end of this school year.

In December, three to four Northville High students will attend a student exchange at Huron High School to discuss topics such as racial intolerances, teen age suicide, anxiety over grades, etc. These students will then share those topics with 60 students from Northville.

Tuman has also agreed to work with Northville High for the rest of the school year to help iron out cultural and interest diversities.

Again, Johnson stressed there is more of an interest diversity problem rather than a racial one at the high school. Either way, conflicts won't be tolerated, though.

"One of our kids may say, 'hey, I'm a freak and I'm happy' but I'm concerned because people are talking about me and jostling me," Johnson said. "We want to create a safe environment."

If a student doesn't feel safe or

comfortable, the learning process is affected.

"To do that (create a comfortable atmosphere), these things have to be addressed," the principal said. "We're the same school we were last year. We just want to address some of the issues that are concerning the kids. . . . We have to address the hard issues to make this the best high school it can be. Sure, I could cover things up and say every now and then we have a fight. But I would just be masking over something that will sooner or later explode."

Johnson said he will not live on the premise 70 percent of other schools do, praying to make it through the week or the school year without any incidents.

"I feel good about what we're doing and the direction we're taking," he said.

Phelps reveals secret behind choice wines

With some regularity over the past few months we've recommended wines from Joseph Phelps Vineyards among our Wine Selections of the Week. That means we think they're head and shoulders above many of their peers in the marketplace.

It's 20 years since Phelps' first commercial crush of Johannisberg Riesling. A two-decade milestone makes Phelps one of Napa Valley's "older" wineries.

Maybe that's the trouble here. Older and established, not new, hot, trendy, splashy, flashy, with bells and whistles, just some consistently stylish, excellent wines with a high quality price ratio made by winemaker Craig Williams who's held this position with Phelps since 1976.

Williams understands the importance of quality grapes in the design of stylish wines. We made our own footprints in the vineyard along with Williams recently.

"Today, wineries must constantly redefine and prove themselves to the wine consuming public," Williams said. "The way is through quality winemaking and delivering a consistent product to the consumer."

On the other hand, Williams contends that it is the consumers' responsibility to search for wines they personally like, and not be dependent upon the ratings of wine critics. He also believes that there's been too much emphasis on how long a wine will age and not on how good it tastes upon release.

"There are very few wines made in the last hundred years that can age gracefully for over 20 years," he said. "It's such a minute fraction of all the wine that was made, yet some critics give it significant attention. This is not reality."

"I feel fortunate if one of the Phelps reds lasts 10 years. Let's face it, why would anyone want to stock up on hundreds of bottles of ponderous wine? Wine is meant to be drunk and enjoyed. This is the kind of wine I try to deliver."

Because of the major replanting necessary in the Napa Valley due to the current phylloxera infestation, California producers in their replanting efforts have begun to pay more attention to soil profiles.

"Our ranches have different soils and challenges and this is not the case in France," Williams, a frequent visitor to French vineyards, points out. "A French vineyard is, generally speaking, one plot of soil with similar properties throughout."

"In Napa Valley, we have the inverse challenge of the French. What's done in France, we've translated to our vineyards. They've learned over hundreds of years the systems

WINE SELECTION OF THE WEEK

Some out-of-the-ordinary wines to try: Michigan-born Dan Moore, owner of Z Moore Winery in California's Sonoma County is doing some very creative winemaking with gewurztraminer.

The varietal is hard to pronounce, but in the Z Moore style, it's great drinking. Try 1991 Dry Gewurztraminer (\$10.50), the very stylish 1991 Puncbeon Select Gewurztraminer (\$13.50) or the truly "new wave" Barrel Select (\$16.75).

Ca'del Solo wines are brought to you by the imaginative Randall Graham, winemaker at Bonny Doon Vineyard. The 1991 vintage of Malvasia Bianca (\$10) is an intensely aromatic and dry aperitif sipper while the Pescatore (\$13.50) is dry, but complexed with barrel fermentation and suited for grilled fish. Moscato del Solo (\$10.50) is a low alcohol (7 percent) dessert wine that is simply delicious.

Clivo (\$11) from Italy's Ruffino is a delicious blend of sangiovese, cabernet sauvignon and pinot noir in a rose style. Also from Ruffino is Torgato (\$9.50), a new-style sangiovese with lively fruit to be enjoyed young and fresh.

1992 Preston Vineyards Faux (\$10) takes its inspiration from the blended red wines of the southern Rhone Valley. This is a great hamburger or pizza wine: a garlic-lover's wine and a red wine that's just plain fun to drink.

GOIN' MOBILE
Entertain without leaving taste home

With fall upon us, we must all prepare for the change in the weather — and the transformation of our weekends.

Friendly weekend get-togethers will most likely be disrupted by the game of the week. Don't try competing with the talk of the town, but invite family and friends to a festive tailgate party meant to rally your team to victory.

Experienced entertainers should see the benefits immediately. Wear and tear on the home is eliminated, as is most of the post-party mess. Best of all, hosts need not worry about decorating, coming up with a theme or creating ambience — a noisy, packed parking lot and a car stereo provide all that.

In this region of the country fall temperatures seem to drop faster than the leaves, so remind guests to dress warmly (in team colors, of course), and throw a few extra blankets in the trunk, just in case. Take along a folding card table on which to set up the feast. Ask guests to bring lawn chairs.

PREPARATION

Careful planning is not only wise but necessary when preparing for a party away from home. It will allow the host more time to enjoy visiting with guests, or to take part in the makeshift ballgame or Frisbee throw.

More importantly, it is virtually impossible to wing it once the car has pulled out of the driveway. If you are not prepared by then, your guests will be heading for the concession stands before the game even begins.

However, don't be frightened because you must leave the microwave and refrigerator behind. Your first instinct may be to pick up a bucket of chicken or some take-out pizza. But with a little planning, you can prepare a delicious tailgate spread yourself.

Opt for foods that can be prepared completely in advance and aren't too troublesome to transport. Stay away from dishes that could end up making a mess of your back seat. A big pot of stew may sound delicious, but probably won't make it through the first traffic light.

LOADING UP

This may be the most crucial step — making sure that the wonderful meal you have created makes it to the game in good shape. Take the time to package food carefully, or your car's upholstery will never be the same.

Use containers with lids that stay in place, and don't count on a little tin foil and a paper plate to do the job.

It's important to keep food at the correct temperature. Use coolers to keep chilled foods and drinks cold until time to serve them. Wrap warm foods in a layer of foil and pack them into a separate insulated carrier.

Gather all paper goods, flatware, the necessary utensils and condiments well ahead of time. If you grab these items on the way out the door, you could end up wiping your hands on your blankets.

MENU IN MOTION

Dare to try a colorful and creative pre-game party menu. Your gathering may well be in the middle of a ballgame, but that does not mean you have to settle for hot dogs, baked beans, sandwiches and other ordinary fare. After all, your guests could probably purchase those things from the vendors at the stadium.

Plan on serving a variety of hors d'oeuvres or finger foods in lieu of a main dish. Guests can then continue to eat for the duration of the party. After all, snacking makes it easier to socialize, which is the goal of most party-goers anyway.

When counting on hors d'oeuvres to tempt their taste buds, coordinate your selection of appetizers. Serve them in a variety of temperatures, shapes, colors and textures to create interest. However, take care when mixing in terms of cuisine.

Decide on a particular style, whether you choose Italian-, Latin- or Oriental-inspired dishes, casual or elegant tastes.

Don't worry too much about presentation. Tailgate parties are meant to be low-key. Leave your best serving wares at home, opting instead for non-breakable, reusable platters like the attractive ones many caterers use.

ARTICHOKES WITH SPICY CRAB

- 24 baby artichokes
- 1 lemon
- ¾ pound fresh cooked crabmeat
- ¼ cup whipping cream
- 1 tablespoon capers
- ¼ cup finely chopped green peppers
- 2 tablespoons minced green onion
- 2 teaspoons Dijon mustard



An assortment of hors d'oeuvres and finger foods can replace the usual array of sandwiches at your next stadium meal.

- 1 tablespoon butter
- 1 teaspoon olive oil
- 3 tablespoons minced shallot
- 2 tablespoons white wine
- salt and pepper to taste
- Worcestershire sauce to taste
- Minced parsley
- Lemon wedges

Pull off dark green outer leaves of artichokes until you reach pale green "heart." Cut ¼-inch off top and trim stem end down to pale green part.

Rub artichoke hearts well with lemon and cook in boiling salted water until tender. Drain and pat dry. Pull out some of innermost leaves and spread hearts open slightly. In bowl, combine crabmeat, cream, capers, green pepper, green onion and mustard. In small skillet over moderate heat, heat butter and oil. Add shallots and cook until translucent, about 4 to 5 minutes. Add wine and cook until mixture is reduced to a glaze. Cool slightly and add to crab mixture. Season to taste with salt, pepper and Worcestershire sauce.

Stuff artichoke hearts with crab mixture. Pack into tightly sealed container along with plastic bag of minced parsley and lemon wedges. At serving time, garnish hearts with minced parsley and serve with lemon wedges. Yields 12 servings.

NEW POTATOES WITH CAVIAR

- 3 dozen tiny red-skinned new potatoes
- Olive oil
- Kosher salt
- Juice of 1 lemon

- 12 ounces assorted caviar (golden, red and black)
- Sour cream
- Lemon wedges

Steam potatoes over boiling salted water until they are just tender when pierced. Dry them well, drizzle them while hot with olive oil, then sprinkle with salt and lemon juice. Cut off top of each potato about ¼-inch down, scoop out and discard some of inside pulp, leaving a firm, thick-sided shell. Wrap potatoes in foil and place in a tightly sealed container.

At serving time, set out potato "shells," caviars, sour cream, lemon wedges, some tiny serving spoons, and plenty of napkins. Guests can fill their potato "shells" with sour cream and the caviar of their choice, with a little lemon juice squeezed over the top. Yields 12 servings.

While you're readying the rest of the hors d'oeuvres, pass these toasted walnut "bites."

WALNUT GORGONZOLA BITES

- 72 perfect walnut halves
- ¾ pound ripe Gorgonzola cheese, at room temperature
- 3 tablespoons unsalted butter

Preheat oven to 350 F. Toast walnut halves on cookie sheet until they are fragrant and lightly browned. Cool completely.

Stocks are literally backbone of great taste

With stock fundamentals: stocks are the backbone for all cooking. They serve as a base for sauces, soups, stews, braises and a cooking medium for grains and vegetables.

Pasta is about the only thing in our kitchen that we make in just plain old water. Rice for a paella is prepared in fumet, risotto for a chicken piccata in chicken stock and a polenta for short ribs in remouillage.

With coq au vin we'll oven braise the chicken in a mixture of stock and red wine. Lamb shanks are enriched with a bit of veal stock and salmon poached in a delicate saffron essence enhanced with shrimp and lobster shells.

I can't imagine cooking in anything but one of the flavorful liquids we call stocks. There are four on hand in our kitchen at all times. Chicken, veal, vegetable and fish.

The fish stock I wrote about last week and, I'll admit, is my favorite . . . or equally favored with vegetable. These are also the most delicate in flavor.

Any stock's taste should be subtle enough to allow recognition without knocking you off your chair with a taste of the main flavoring ingredient, i.e. in the case of chicken, chicken, or beef in beef,

and so on.

There are also various styles of stocks. A white stock is clear and achieved through the gentle simmering of bones (chicken, veal, beef) in water to extract the proteins that provide flavor. Brown stock, on the other hand, is an amber liquid made from browned bones and vegetables simmered in water.

A fumet is generally made with fish bones. The vegetables are first sweated, the bones cut into small pieces to allow the most gelatin to leech out and the addition of water or fish poaching liquid. For instance, when we poach our shrimp, the court bouillon, an aromatic vegetable broth with a touch of wine, is saved for the making of fumet. This allows more depth to the end product.

A glace is a reduced stock that acquires a jelly like texture with extremely condensed flavor. Broth is the liquid obtained from simmering meat. This can be used, as a court bouillon, as the base of a stock instead of water.

And finally, remouillage, a re-wetting or second stock from the same bones. After straining our veal stock we pour cold water over the same bones and simmer for an additional six hours. The effect is not nearly as pleasing as the first stock but this liquid is marvelous for braising, reducing for soups or for use as the basis for the next veal stock.

Bones, at least in the quantities that we use them, are not reasonable. A "double stock" is mandatory. It is important to remember that the more surface area on the

bones, the more flavorful the outcome.

Also note that a stock is only as good as the ingredients used. I've worked in kitchens that save onion peels, carrot shavings and cuttings from vegetables that belong in the garbage in their "stocks." Forget it!!! Throw it out and use fresh.

On the other hand, when poaching chickens for chicken salad and pot pies we'll add the bones to augment the raw chicken backs and feet. The poach liquid becomes the "water" in the recipe and the succeeding outcome is heavenly golden and intensely aromatic.

Last night walking out of the restaurant after locking up I caught a fragrance that can't be beat by any perfume. A veal stock in the final hours of reduction. What a way to end a day!!!

In small bowl, work cheese and butter together with wooden spoon. Sandwich two nut halves with a dab of cheese mixture. Refrigerate briefly to firm cheese. Serve cool but not cold. Yields 3 dozen.

ANTIPASTO SKEWERS

1 large OR 2 small seasonal melons, peeled and cut into 36 cubes
 1/4 pound prosciutto, sliced paper-thin
 1 pound Italian fontina cheese, cut into 36 cubes
 36 best-quality olives
 Olive oil
 Freshly ground black pepper

Wrap each cube of melon in a piece of prosciutto.

On each of 36 skewers, thread a cube of cheese, an olive, and a prosciutto-melon cube. Place skewers in tightly sealed container.

At serving time, drizzle with olive oil and dust with freshly ground black pepper. Yields 3 dozen skewers.

PANBALLE

1 pound cooked tiny shrimp
 2 red onions, coarsely chopped
 1/4 cup olive oil
 3 tablespoons lemon juice
 1 tablespoon minced fresh oregano

salt and pepper to taste
 6 (8-inch) day-old French rolls
 3 ripe tomatoes, thinly sliced

In small bowl, combine shrimp, onions, 2 tablespoons olive oil, lemon juice, oregano and salt and pepper to taste.

Slice rolls in half lengthwise. Moisten each half with a little of remaining olive oil. Arrange tomato slices on bottom half.

Spread shrimp mixture over tomato slices and add top half of roll. Wrap each sandwich tightly in foil.

At serving time, slice each sandwich in halves or thirds.

POLYNESIAN SHRIMP

3 pounds large prawns, boiled and shelled
 2 tablespoons minced parsley
 1 teaspoon grated lemon peel

Plum Sauce:

2 pounds purple plums
 1/4 cup lemon juice
 1/4 cup red wine vinegar
 1/4 cup Japanese plum wine or sake
 1 tablespoon Dijon-style mustard
 Cayenne pepper to taste

Arrange prawns on serving platter. Combine parsley and lemon peel and sprinkle over prawns. Serve with plum sauce and cocktail picks.

To make plum sauce, cut a cross in bottom of each plum. Plunge into boiling water briefly, then into a bowl of ice water. Peel the plums (skins should peel off easily) and pit them. In food pro-

cessor or blender, combine plums and lemon juice and process until smooth. Stir in vinegar, plum wine or sake, and mustard. Season with cayenne pepper and salt.

Serve over prawns with cocktail picks. Yields 10 servings.

BAKED ARTICHOKE SAVORIES

2 tablespoons chopped onion
 1 teaspoon minced garlic
 1/4 cup sherry
 3 egg whites
 1 whole egg
 1/4 cup bread crumbs
 3 tablespoons minced parsley
 1/4 teaspoon dried dill
 1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper
 1 cup grated low-fat mozzarella cheese
 1/4 cup low-fat ricotta cheese

10 ounces marinated artichoke hearts, drained and chopped

Preheat oven to 350 F. Lightly oil 8-inch square baking pan.

In medium skillet over medium heat, saute onion and garlic in sherry until soft but not browned. Lightly beat egg whites until soft peaks form. Spoon into bowl and mix with whole egg, bread crumbs, parsley, dill, cayenne, cheeses and artichokes. Add sauteed onion and garlic. Pour into prepared baking pan.

Bake until set (about 30 minutes). Let cool, then cut into about 25 squares. Serve warm or cold.

Avoid uneven microwave cooking

"The microwave oven has become a common household item which can be a real boon for saving time," said Sylvia Tretman, home economist for the Oakland County Cooperative Extension Service. "There are some very simple yet effective tips to help you cook safely with your microwave."

The main concern is ensuring that food is completely cooked, yet not so hot that it may burn a baby's mouth.

Cold spots can occur because of the irregular way the microwaves enter the oven and are absorbed by various foods.

"Learning placement and special microwave techniques is a good idea," adds Tretman, who suggests either buying a microwave book or taking a class. Some tips to help with safe microwave cooking:

- Arrange food items uniformly.

- Turn food several times — or stir or rotate dish during cooking.

- Observe standing time when called for.

- Use utensils made for the microwave.

- Avoid use of cold storage containers, like margarine tubs — they can melt.

- Never use brown bags or newspapers which can catch on fire.

- Heat leftovers to at least 165 degrees.

- Use caution when warming baby food and formula — stir and taste before serving.

that work. Phelps and others have only been growing grapes since the early 1970s.

From the 1970s through the 1980s Williams believes the California focus was on winemaking, not on grapegrowing. "This is the great challenge of phylloxera," he said. "Today, we're paying much more attention to soils and matching the variety on the correct phylloxera resistant rootstock within its proper soil profile. The world has yet to see the great wines of California."

There's been a lot of well-deserved attention given to California's planting of Rhone varietals. Phelps is one of the leaders in this emerging wine category. Four of these Rhone-styled wines are under the Vin du Mistral label. 1992 Grenache Rose (\$10) is not a wimpy wine. It's actually more delicious than many stemming from France's Rhone Valley. Light-bodied and refreshing, its raspberry fruit makes it a terrific match with a variety of Mediterranean dishes.

The 1992 Vin du Mistral Viognier (\$13) gives new meaning to this white varietal. Phelps' 19-acre commitment to it, gives indication of how serious a wine this is. Floral

and tropical fruit accents make this wine a great aperitif with fruit and mild cheeses or in harmony with grilled white fish.

Syrah's the "in" red from California. Its popularity comes in great measure from wines like the Vin du Mistral 1990 Syrah (\$9.50). We like this spicy, peppery fruit-accented wine with game and stews. Last, but not least, is the 1991 Le Mistral (\$15), a blend of the five southern Rhone red grape varieties used in

making Chateaufort-du-Pape. Its spicy aromas and abundant red fruit flavors pair it handsomely with autumn's heartier dishes or with a meatless preparation of grilled vegetables, ratatouille or spicy chili.

Phelps makes a host of traditional wines including chardonnay, sauvignon blanc, gewurztraminer and Johannisberg riesling (both dry and late harvest styles). Two dessert wines, scheurebe and

Delice du Semillon are excellent. Among the reds are cabernet sauvignon, merlot, zinfandel and the ultimate expression of a red Bordeaux-style blend Insignia.

The 1989 Insignia (\$35) is dynamic now, but will build even more complexity in the bottle for another five to six years.

Motto for this year's holiday baker: 'be prepared'

Delight in the holidays, don't dread them. Start your ovens now, and bake a little at a time so you won't feel overwhelmed.

Cookies, except those with custard or cream fillings, freeze well. "It's a lot to try to bake and decorate cookies in one day," said Jackie Sheehan, senior editor of Pillsbury's "The Complete Book of Baking." (Viking, \$25, hardcover). "Don't decorate until just before you're ready to use them."

Sheehan and I talked about baking holiday cookies Thursday while she was visiting metro Detroit to promote the cookbook.

When you're making cookies, take time to measure accurately, and don't substitute diet or whipped margarine for butter and regular margarine in recipes.

"Whipped margarine contains air, and diet margarines have water in them. They don't work," said Sheehan. Be careful when reducing the amount of sugar in a recipe too.

"Sugar adds sweetness, it helps the product brown, and adds to the tenderness. It plays a very significant role," said Sheehan. "It's safe to cut

the amount of sugar in a recipe back to 1/4 to 1/2."

For more advice on holiday baking from home economists, call the Land O'Lakes Holiday Bakeline toll-free number, 1-800-782-9606 through Dec. 24, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.

All bakeline callers will receive a free "Bake a Holiday Tradition" recipe booklet, filled with traditional favorites from around the world plus helpful baking tips.

"Each year, we receive calls from people who have lost a family recipe for need help preparing family favorites. We're here to lend a helping hand," said Lydia Botham, director of consumer affairs and test kitchens at Land O'Lakes, Inc.

Pillsbury also offers a toll-free hotline to help consumers with baking questions. Look for it on all Pillsbury products.

Take time to check expiration dates on your baking supplies before you fire up the oven, and get out the cookie cutters.

Sylvia Treilman, home economist for the Oakland County Cooperative Extension Service, offered these

guidelines.

● **Baking powder** — Keep no more than six months. To test if your baking powder is still good, measure one teaspoon of baking powder and put into 1/4 cup hot water. It should fizz and bubble.

● **Baking Soda** — Up to 18 months. ● **Flour** — Refrigerate whole wheat flour, toss white flour that's more than a year old.

● **Sugar** — Is fine as long as it hasn't solidified. Here are a couple of ways to loosen brown sugar — put the box in a microwave oven with a cup of water for two minutes. Or, put the brown sugar in a Tupperware container with a piece of bread or slice of apple. It will loosen up in a couple of days.

● **Vanilla and other extracts** — Won't spoil, but will start to lose their flavor in three to four months.

● **Vegetable shortening** — Toss after a year.

● **Butter** — Keeps frozen for six to nine months, refrigerated a few weeks beyond expiration date on the box.

● **Margarine** — Keeps refrigerated

four to five months.

● **Chocolate chips** — Dark chocolate is good up to a year, milk chocolate six months.

● **Eggs** — Toss three to four weeks after expiration date on the carton.

● **Nuts** — If you're not going to use them soon, store in the freezer for up to a year.

BERRY BERRY STREUSEL BARS

(Filling) 1 cup fresh or frozen blueberries

1 teaspoon all-purpose flour

1/2 cup raspberry or strawberry preserves

1/2 teaspoon lemon peel (optional) (Oatmeal Crust)

1 1/2 cups Quaker oats (quick or old-fashioned, uncooked)

1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour

1/2 cup firmly packed brown sugar

3/4 cup (1 1/2 sticks) margarine or butter, melted

To prepare Oatmeal Crust — heat oven to 350 degrees. Combine oats, flour and sugar; mix well. Add margarine, mix well.

Reserve 1 cup of crust mixture; set aside. Press remaining mixture onto bottom of 8 or 9-inch square baking pan. Bake 13 to 15 minutes or until light golden brown. Cool slightly.

For filling, in medium bowl, combine blueberries and flour; mix well. Stir in preserves and lemon peel. Spread evenly over crust. Sprinkle with reserved oat mixture, pressing lightly. Bake 20 to 22 minutes or until light golden brown. Cut into bars. Store loosely covered. Yield 16 bars. Can be frozen.

PEANUT BUTTER BLOSSOMS

1 1/4 cups all purpose flour

1/2 cup sugar

1/2 cup firmly packed brown sugar

1 teaspoon baking soda

1/2 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon vanilla
1 egg
Sugar
48 milk chocolate candy kisses

Heat oven to 375 degrees. In large bowl, combine flour, 1/4 cup sugar, brown sugar, baking soda, salt, shortening, peanut butter, milk, vanilla and egg; blend at low speed until stiff dough forms.

Shape into 1-inch balls; roll in sugar. Place 2 inches apart on ungreased cookie sheets.

Bake at 375 degrees for 10 to 12 minutes or until golden brown. Immediately top each cookie with a candy kiss, pressing down firmly so cookie cracks around edge; remove from cookie sheets. Cool completely. Yield: 4 dozen. Can be frozen.

CITY OF NORTHVILLE CODE OF ORDINANCES ARTICLE IV — SNOW AND ICE

Sec. 7-135 SIDEWALKS; SNOW, ICE; REMOVAL REQUIRED — No person shall permit any snow or ice to remain on the sidewalks in the front, rear or sides of any house, premises, building or lot owned, occupied or controlled by him, longer than 24 hours after the same has fallen or formed; and where either has fallen or formed on any such sidewalk, such owner, occupant or his agent as above provided shall within 24 hours after the same has fallen or formed, remove said snow or ice, or cause a sufficient quantity of salt, sand or ashes to be strewn thereon in such a manner as to render the same safe for persons walking thereon. NO SNOW AND/OR ICE REMOVED FROM PRIVATE PARKING LOTS AND DRIVEWAYS SHALL BE MOVED, DEPOSITED OR PUSHED INTO, OR ACROSS ANY STREET OR ALLEY IN ANY MANNER WHICH IMPEDES TRAFFIC OR SUBSTANTIALLY REDUCES THE MAINTAINED ROADWAY SURFACE. (1-26-78)

Sec. 7-136 DEFINITIONS — For purposes of this article, the phrase sidewalks in the front, rear or sides of any house, premises, lot or building shall be construed to mean that sidewalk or walks forming a part of the public highway.

Sec. 7-137 FIRST OFFENSE — Whenever there are upon any defined sidewalks within the City, snow or ice for a period exceeding 24 hours after the same has fallen or formed, the City Ordinance Enforcement Officer shall notify in writing the owner, occupant or his agent either by personal delivery or certified mail to remove any snow or ice, which has remained there more than 24 hours after the same has fallen.

Sec. 7-138 FAILURE TO COMPLY — If the snow or ice are not removed as provided and within the time so specified by the notice required by Section 7-137 of Article IV, the City shall cause their removal and the owner or occupant of the lot or premises shall be liable to the City for the cost incurred for the removal of the snow or ice, including any costs related to notification, enforcement and Administrative costs.

Sec. 7-139 SUBSEQUENT OFFENSES: If the owner, occupant or his agent shall fail to remove snow and ice within 24 hours after the same has fallen or formed and that owner, occupant or his agent has previously failed to comply after receiving notification as stated in Section 7-137 of Article IV, the City shall remove the snow and ice without further notification and the owner or occupant of the lot or premises shall be liable to the City for costs incurred for the removal of snow and/or ice as stated in Section 7-137.

Sec. 7-140 CHARGES/FEES: All charges for snow/ice removal, notification, enforcement and administrative costs shall become due at such time as the service is rendered. If such charges are not paid within 45 days after the same are billed to the owner or occupant, a penalty of 10% shall be added thereto. Charges not paid by June 1st shall be placed on the next general tax roll with an additional 10% penalty and collected as part of the general City taxes.

Sec. 7-141 PENALTY — Any person who shall neglect or refuse to comply with the provisions of Article IV, Section 7-135 through Section 7-139, shall upon conviction, be subject to a fine of not more than \$100.00 in the discretion of the court.

Thomas returns as John Boy in 'Walton Reunion'

By John Crook

'You can go home again,' says Richard Thomas. 'That's the nice thing about it.'

The actor is speaking about his return to the role that won him an Emmy 20-plus years ago: John Boy Walton. Thomas joins Michael Learned, Ralph Waite and other original cast members for "A Walton Thanksgiving Reunion," airing Sunday, Nov. 21, on CBS.

Calling from Washington, D.C., where he is finishing up a wildly acclaimed run as Shakespeare's "Richard II," Thomas says the personal reunion with his former castmates "wasn't a party I wanted to miss. We were all thrilled to be together. The show was a great part of our lives, and something I think we all were very grateful for."

The 42-year-old actor had to overcome some daunting logistical problems to squeeze even a tight Los Angeles shooting schedule into his theatrical performances in the nation's capital, and the outcome seemed a little surrealistic at times.

"I was only there for a few days, so for me it was kind of like hallucinating," he recalls. Then, in a

breathless, unbroken account, he explains: "I finished ('Richard II') on Sunday, matinee and evening, and flew out at dawn on Monday, and they drove me to the set, and I shot Monday and Tuesday, then Tuesday night they drove me back to the airport and I took the red-eye back to Washington and got my robes back on again for 'Richard II.' I felt like I was in a dream state half the time. But it was wonderful; it was great."

Thomas says he left "The Waltons" at the end of the 1976-77 season (the fifth) only because he had intended to do so from the very beginning of the series. "I came back in the sixth year and did two episodes so everybody would know it wasn't because there was any conflict. It was just a career decision. I felt that I had done everything I could do (with John Boy) on a regular basis."

The TV movie takes place in 1963, with the Waltons gathering for Thanksgiving under the shock and gloom of the recent Kennedy assassination. If John Boy was 16 in 1929, as the series had it, then in "Reunion" he must be...

"Don't try to figure out the age,"

Thomas says, laughing. "The math doesn't work. It's like a Shakespeare play. You can't really figure out how old he is. We play games with time." The known circumstances in John Boy's life, however - his status as an established writer, his interest in marrying and settling down - suggest that the character is now in his mid-30s, the actor adds.

Slipping into John Boy's skin came disconcertingly easy after 17 years away, Thomas says. "I kind of let my own changes be his changes, rather than trying to create some kind of detailed past life. I figured... 'Let me just bring my own stuff into it and see what happens.' After all, it is me later and it is him later, and we are kind of connected, joined at the hip, so to speak."

"I put on the wardrobe and stood out there on the back lot and did a rehearsal with an actress - and he (John Boy) was right there, all the time. He had been lurking for 17 years, I just kind of gave him a quieter sort of (personality)...maybe a little more pensive, a little more inward."

Thomas agrees with his co-star and close friend Learned that many TV critics missed the boat with the CBS series. "There was a lot of condescension about the show...not on the public's part at all. The public adored the show. When things get mythologized, people forget what they really were. People say, 'Oh, what a perfect family!' Well, it wasn't a perfect family. It wasn't supposed to be. The whole point was that it wasn't perfect. It simply stuck together."

The Manhattan-born and -reared Thomas says his father's family had much in common with the Waltons. "He was raised in the hills of eastern Kentucky during the Depression. Lots of aunts and uncles all living together and working through their lives. (The show was) very accurate, actually. I spent every summer of my life on (my grandparents') farm there. My roots are very deep in the hills of eastern Kentucky. I go there every year. Most of my family members are located in a part of the world that's almost exactly like... 'The Waltons.'"

Tucci steps into role of Amanda Cory

When Sandra Reinhardt decided to leave the role of Amanda Cory on "Another World" to pursue other interests, the show's brass immediately began auditioning new talent to fill the void. Amanda was involved in a major story line, and "AW" needed someone to step in and pick up where Reinhardt left off.

Enter statuesque brunette Christine Tucci, the blond Reinhardt's polar opposite. "It's funny," says Tucci, "at the screen test there were about six or seven other women, and they were all blond. I was sitting there thinking 'What the heck am I doing here?' I never thought about looking at it as 'Hey, I'm the only dark woman here, maybe I'll stand out.' It was one of those the glass-is-half-empty kind of situations."

Tucci made such a big impression that the character has been taken in a different direction. Amanda is now a little more serious with a lot more brains. "The producer, writers and myself are in agreement that Amanda should be stronger and more like her mother Rachel (Victoria Wyndham).

"It is kind of strange how reality and non-reality are mirroring each other right now," Tucci says. "Amanda is taking what she has learned from Rachel and is applying it to her life, and at the same time I am learning from Vicky (Wyndham) and doing the same thing."

Amanda is Tucci's first television role, and she says it has been no easy task keeping up with the rigors of daytime. "I knew what I was getting into when I started, but it has been tough. The other day I was really tired and stressed out and Vicky looked at me and said 'You have not figured out how to have a life yet, have you?' And I realized I hadn't. There are some people who come in and learn their lines while they are in the makeup chair. I just couldn't do it. I work for 12 hours and then go home and learn lines for the next day."

When Tucci does have some free time, she hangs out with friends and enjoys painting, singing, reading and shopping.

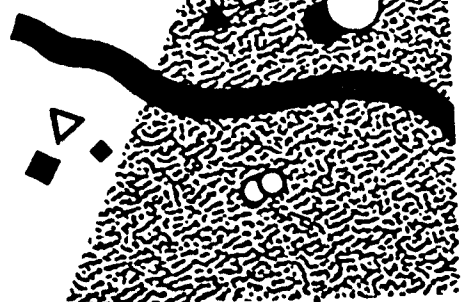
