

## Traffic flow, placement of new decks debated

The devil is in the details, as city staff members are discovering about their Mainstreet '93 plan.

The \$3.8 million plan — already eyeballed by the city's planning commission and historic district commission — came under close scrutiny at the downtown development authority's morning meeting last Tuesday, Nov. 23. The city hopes to use tax capturing from the downtown development district to rebuild the Cady Street deck, add a new deck

along Center Street south of Main Centre and build a paved, lighted lot on the south side of East Cady next year.

DDA members agree that more parking is needed but questioned traffic flow around the new decks and the location of the Center Street structure on what some consider prime land for commercial development.

The first few questions from the DDA concerned Mainstreet '93's major funding source, the diversion of increases in property tax revenue from the city's downtown development district to the project.

DDA member Mike Allen questioned the

diversion of funds from the city's general fund to the project.

"The big taxpayers are getting nothing out of this," he fumed.

City Manager Gary Word noted that the money is being funneled through the general fund from the city's share of recaptured diverted taxes, and does not represent a city contribution as much as a diversion of existing taxes on the downtown businesses.

DDA member Greg Presley then asked why the plan still included a provision for recapturing part of the diverted taxes. The provision had originally been included to mollify

school officials over the continued diversion of potential tax revenue from the schools, by allowing them to recapture part of the tax diversion.

Christiansen noted that the provision was retained in case the state Legislature does reinstate a property tax funding system for schools.

Several design changes have already been made to the plan first unveiled at a special joint meeting Nov. 10. The deck's designers at Rich & Associates have incorporated a 10-foot corridor between the rebuilt Cady Street deck and the commercial building to

the east, to allow outside pedestrian access between Cady Street and Mary Alexander Court.

Handicapped access between the two streets will be provided by way of the stair/elevator tower at the northeast corner of the deck.

The corridor, which had been included in the much larger Mainstreet '92 plan, was reinstated at the request of the historic district commission two weeks ago.

## Governor gets local resolution on reform

Gov. John Engler should have the Northville Board of Education's resolution on reform on his desk by now.

As should Michigan House members of the bipartisan team labeled the "Fabulous Fourteen," local legislators, the PTA Coordinating Council, Legislative Action Network and various media.

"The resolution supports the basic tenants and principles the board feels comfortable with in funding and quality," superintendent Leonard Reznierski said. "I think it's very credible."

The resolution states the Northville board cannot endorse any proposal which "does not address the state's responsibility to adequately fund education" and believes reform should "ensure equity in the scope and quality of instructional programs offered to all students regardless of what public school they attend."

The board also highlighted several points in quality and funding issues for public schools. They are:

- Quality
- P.A. 25 should be the basis for school reform. Its components should be supported, strengthened and funded.
- All school reform measures should be research based.
- Reform proposals should provide financial provisions for on-going staff development.
- School districts should have the ability to determine how to meet state established standards and expectations.
- Funding
- The state should provide a stable, balanced and equitable source of revenue which ensures full replacement of all existing revenues.
- Specific provisions should be included in the reform proposal which provide for stability in revenue allocation to school districts beyond the initial year.
- The property tax should be maintained as one of the major revenue sources, along with the income tax and sales tax.
- The property tax should be a local tax.
- Each district should have the op-

## Oil company representatives resurface around township

Buyers beware.

That's the message members of the Northville Preservation Association (NPA) are sending out to township residents before oil and gas leasing agents come knocking again.

It's the same message the group sent out nearly five years ago when leasing agents inundated the township looking to strike it rich and promising homeowners a way to do the same.

Nowadays oil and gas companies seem to be taking a renewed interest in Northville Township and neighboring communities like Novi. NPA's Zo Chisnell said agents have recently resurfaced on the porches of Novi homeowners living between Eight and Eleven Mile Roads, off Meadowbrook.

They've also been seen in the township during the last year near homes at Six Mile and Sheldon Road.

Chisnell and fellow NPA member Carol Andrikides said the best thing township and Novi city residents can do is play it safe and know their rights when leasing agents come calling.

"People don't know that much about it," Chisnell said about township residents who have been talked into signing away their mineral rights to leasing agents who promise them a

pretty penny in exchange for the right to drill for oil in their backyards.

"It sounds like good, easy money so they sign on."

Years ago, Chisnell said leasing agents converged on township homeowners and offered them money in exchange for the rights to drill on their property for crude oil.

Chisnell said industry companies got turned onto the neighboring communities after geological studies from the state Department of Natural Resources proved that township homeowners were sitting on a "nice stream" of crude oil that travels through Northville and runs northwest through Milford, South Lyon and Brighton.

"There's a high grade of crude oil and there's a lot of it," Andrikides said.

Because studies show crude oil is abundant under the surface here, Chisnell said oil and gas companies

## Residential plan debated, passed

It took hours of debate, but Tuesday night Northville Township Planning Commissioners finally reached an accord with the developers of Stone Water Lakes, a large residential development heading into Seven Mile Road.

Deliberations on the proposed concept plan were resumed this week after commissioners and developers failed to reach an agreement on lot sizes and frontages, rear and side setback requirements last week.

In the end and in the spirit of compromise the commission and the developers agreed to approve the conceptual plan with at least 23 conditions tied to its approval. The approval scaled the development

back two lots from 414 to 412.

Commissioners voted 6-1 to approve the plan.

The list of conditions controlled everything from the number of buildable lots to front, rear and side setbacks, to 12-foot backyard deck setbacks. It was also mandated that the developer agree to build cul de sacs with islands and sidewalks on Beck Road.

Further approval of the plan is also contingent on securing necessary permits from the State Department of Natural Resources.

Planning Commissioner Robert Willerer cast the lone vote against the plan, saying that developers failed to explain why they needed all of the proposed units to make the project

The Monday newspaper was terminated with the Nov. 29 edition. From now on, subscribers will receive only the regular Thursday edition.

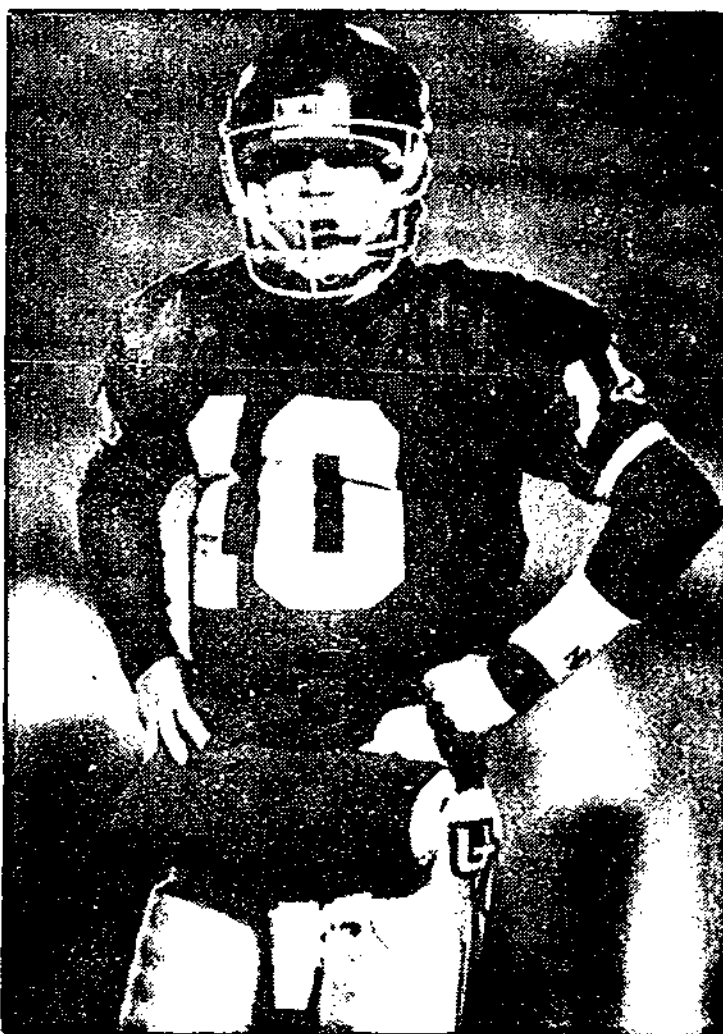

## New area code rings in the holidays

The new 810 telephone area code went into effect yesterday, Dec. 1, for portions of southeastern Michigan.

Most of the Northville community is included in the new area code, necessitated by the proliferation of fax, modem and cellular numbers in recent years.

Ameritech officials say the change is being phased in, and people will be able to use either 313 or 810 when dialing long distance within affected areas until Aug. 10 (8/10) of 1994.

All Northville telephone exchanges are affected, including: 344, 347, 348, 349, 380 and 305.

A small percentage of customers in Northville Township have what might be called "Plymouth" prefixes and will remain in the 313 code area.

Plymouth exchanges include 416, 420, 451, 453, 454, 455, 459 and 981.

Under a special arrangement, however, people with Northville and Plymouth exchanges will be able to call back and forth between those two communities without dialing 1-313 beforehand.

"If it was a seven-digit number before, it'll be a seven-digit number now," said Ameritech spokesman Phil Jones.

Ameritech officials say the special arrangement was made because some Northville Township residents with Plymouth exchanges didn't want to have to dial long distance when calling their children's schools or their community's library or municipal offices.

The area code dialing exemption is permitted only for people calling from Northville and Plymouth numbers.

Ameritech officials say the new area codes will not affect long-distance rates or charges, as calls that were considered local before are still local now.

# Cashier confronts woman in Mobil bathroom

Both women intend to press charges against the other for assault and battery, according to the police report.

## Commission approves outdoor service deck for Woolly Bully's

Northville Township Planners approved Woolly Bully's request for an outdoor service deck Tuesday night.

The 1,600 square foot deck will seat and serve 60 lunch and dinner patrons at the Seven Mile Road establishment from 11 a.m. to 10 p.m. After 10 p.m. the deck will close and bar patrons will be asked to remain inside, according to Woolly Bully's owner Mark Roman.

Township Planner Brad Strader told officials this was the applicant's second request for a deck. The first time plans for a deck were thwarted because of the lack of sufficient parking at the restaurant.

But now that Roman has expanded his parking lot to 164 spaces, the deck has resurfaced. He contends the deck will not add seating capacity or violate any township noise ordinances.

But before the commission voted 6-0 to approve the plan with five con-

ditions, they wanted assurances from Roman that music and lighting on the deck would be controlled and patrons would be monitored.

He said rock 'n' roll music would be provided to the deck by a separate system and controlled in the restaurant manager's office. The disc jockey's announcements will not be wired to the outside and "none of the inside activity will be taking place on the outside," Roman said.

It was Commissioner Sue Vlangos who asked how Roman planned to

control patrons seated on the deck from dancing in the night club.

"This could be touchy," she said. "Deck customers may decide they want to dance (on the deck)."

But Roman contends deck patrons will be escorted to the deck to dine only. Dancing will be prohibited and the deck will not serve as a holding area for patrons waiting to access the night club, he said.

Commissioners approved the request provided that Roman replace five trees he knocked down during the construction of his parking lot; control the level of music to the township's noise abatement; prohibit dancing; confine food and beverage service to the kitchen and choose a neutral color umbrella to accent the wooden deck tables. The deck must also close at 10 p.m. every night.

## Woolly Bully's lawyer asks Fogg to step down from deck discussion

Northville Township Trustee and Planning Commissioner Russ Fogg remained a part of the commission's discussion and approval of Woolly Bully's outdoor service deck, despite an attempt by the restaurant's attorney to get him unseated Tuesday.

The attorney and restaurateur Mark Roman both questioned Fogg's ability to be objective about the proposed deck after the trustee wrote a critical article about Roman in his neighborhood newsletter, *The Highland Lakes Herald*.

In the article Fogg was critical of the way Roman has been doing business in Northville Township since he opened Woolly Bully's last spring. Fogg also criticized Roman for bulldozing five protected trees on his property when the restaurateur broke ground for his expanded parking lot.

The article also questioned, "sar-

casmatically" Fogg said, the safety of Roman's patrons who would park and sit so close to the railroad tracks.

"...I don't have any personal gain here," Fogg said. "And you may not like what I have to say but hopefully it's going to be objective."

"I don't like people taking down trees and I've always had concerns with the parking lot running back behind the bar," Fogg said Tuesday in his defense. "I don't see a need to disqualify myself."

And neither did Fogg's fellow commissioners, Township Supervisor Karen Baja or Township Manager Bill Richards who were all also in attendance at the meeting.

Commission Chairman Dick Allen was excused from the discussion because he has a relative who works with Roman's architect.

A disgruntled Fogg mumbled through his yes vote to side with the rest of the pack in the 6-0 vote allowing Roman the right to build the deck.

tion to seek additional revenue with voter support.

● Any funding formula should recognize regional variances in the cost of doing business and educating different populations of students.  
● Future funding must reflect growth in costs to the district. This includes rising inflation, increasing

enrollment, retirement and special programming.

● The reform proposal should support appropriate cost containment measures. Collective bargaining reform, statewide bidding for health insurance and consolidation of services should be reviewed and fostered.

● A funding program, not reliant

upon Constitutional change, should be enacted. This would give the people of Michigan a choice and protect school districts should the sales tax option be defeated in February's referendum.

"I'm pleased the board has done this," Rezmierski said of the resolution. "We're just one of a number of groups that support (these points).

We stand ready to defend them."

The board spent a considerable amount of time coming up with the resolution, meeting in a study session and giving individual thought to the process.

"There's a lot more that could be written, but this is a very good resolution for where we stand on the issues," Rezmierski said.

# Charter school concept watered down in legislators' reform plan

The charter school concept just got a lot less complicated. And, more important to Northville school superintendent Leonard Reznierski, less threatening.

House Bill 5124, part of a bipartisan school reform plan developed by the "Fearsome Fourteen," also dubbed the "Fabulous Fourteen," was approved by the Michigan House of Representatives Monday.

The bill, which renames charter schools as public school academies, allows local school districts, intermediate school districts, community colleges and state public universities to grant charters to corporations formed by a teaching group, Reznierski said, reading from informa-

tion he received from Rep. Jerry Vorva, R-Plymouth.

The public school academies would exclude private schools, as the academies would have to be non-profit and could not be affiliated with any church.

In order for the charter to be granted, 75 percent of a school district's certified teachers would have to be in favor of the charter as would 75 percent of the parents with students enrolled in the district, according to the plan.

"They may not charge tuition or discriminate on academic abilities," Reznierski continued reading.

The academies would also have to meet all state mandates, including Public Act 25, the school improvement act.

Reznierski said he wasn't against

the charter school concept, but was concerned with how the state would set up such schools.

"I am not opposed to charter schools from the point of view they offer a different way for us to learn to practice our services to better provide for the student," he said.

He is concerned, however, with the state going off and not researching the charter concept before approving an unlimited number of such schools.

"My design is that they would pilot a (limited) number in Michigan," he said.

Reznierski suggested at least a five-year study be conducted.

"This is a new lily pad we're all jumping to," he said. "What happens in two years if this is a royal bomb?" The superintendent added that

solid research needs to be performed to make the education business better. Rather than offering a "Heinz 57 variety" of charter school concepts, the state would be much better off granting public school academies in different geographical locations on a competitive bidding basis, Reznierski added.

The charter school concept was introduced by Gov. John Engler in his address on educational reform in early October. The idea behind it was to free up restrictions placed on schools by the state and to allow non-union teachers in the schools. The concept is not all that bad, Reznierski said.

"Maybe we need to get on an exercise program to reduce that excess mandate fat," he said. "There are more requirements and mandates on schools than Carter has liver pills."

But with the newest public school academy plan, the concept has changed. Reznierski said although he has heard there are schools in Detroit interested in pursuing the charter school concept, he has heard no one in the Northville area show interest in such an idea.

# Make safety a priority during winter months

Christmas trees aren't the only thing that may light up your house this holiday season. Over 14,000 fires occur in Michigan dwellings each year. And during the winter months, the incidence increases significantly due to home heating accidents.

"Wood stoves and fireplace mishaps are the leading causes of residential fires, with nearly 3,000 blazes linked to these devices each year," Terry Buckles, president of the Michigan Association of Insurance Companies (MAIC) said. "Most are a result of improper maintenance."

MAIC recommends seven basic guidelines for wood-burning safety: 1) buy only equipment approved by a recognized testing laboratory; 2) make certain equipment is installed

according to authorized standards; 3) learn and follow proper rules for operation/maintenance; 4) regularly inspect chimneys and stovepipes for deficiencies and creosote build-up; 5) check stoves for cracks or faulty legs and hinges; 6) keep a fire extinguisher available that is suitable for wood fires; and 7) burn only dry, seasoned wood.

The insurance industry representative also suggests the following safety precautions:

Have working smoke detectors on each floor of your home;

Have fire extinguishers available in key locations throughout the dwelling, including the kitchen;

It is best to store flammable materials in a garage or outside building.

# Data precise, but state report may be misleading

Northville schools Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski has received a copy of the Michigan School Report and is breathing a sigh of relief—sort of.

The figures for Northville schools in the report card are accurate, but the data can still be misleading, the superintendent said.

"There are fairer ways to present the data," Rezmierski said.

He was particularly concerned with the way the report listed district data from the 1991-92 school year while individual building data were taken from the 1992-93 year.

It confuses the public, he said, referring to the Riverview schools entry listed above Northville. Although the

average salary for teachers is listed at \$33,944 (a 1991-92 figure), the lowest salary in an individual building is \$47,027 (a 1992-93 figure).

Northville's building salaries weren't listed because the information sent by Wayne County to the Department of Education was lost.

"I think people have to read this for what it's worth," Rezmierski said about the report.

Northville school officials received a letter from the Department of Education in July, requesting data for the first governor's report card. Data requested included the district's operating millage rate, enrollment, staffing ratio, expenditures per pupil, average salary, average benefits, dropout rate, graduation rate and Michigan Educational Assessment

Program (MEAP) test results.

"We kicked it around... could we compile the information in time, did it mean a hill of beans of difference?" the superintendent wondered.

Only 14 of 34 school districts in Wayne County opted to submit the information requested for the report. Statewide, almost 30 percent of schools did not respond.

By next May, it may be mandatory for school districts to report the data requested, Rezmierski said. In the interim, the Wayne County Superintendent's Association and the Michigan Association of School Administrators are coming up with suggestions on how to make the annual report card more "reader friendly."

Some of their ideas include:

- What are the three-year trends in students' scores on the ACT, SAT, MEAP and national standardized tests?

- That provides more critical information than one year in and one year out," Rezmierski said. "A citizen looking at a district wants to know all those scores."

- What percentage of students take the SAT and ACT tests?

- What percentage of students further their education? What do they do after the first and fifth years of college?

- What number of students receive scholarships on an annual basis? What is the dollar amount of scholarships awarded?

In 1992-93, about 160 students received almost \$550,000 in scholar-

ships, Rezmierski said.

- What is the dropout rate? Although this question is asked on the report now, Rezmierski would like to expand on it.

"I'm more inclined not to just make it a number," he said. "We're in a position to follow up on where a dropout goes. Does he follow through on getting his GED? Maybe he went to another district, to another state. We have to separate 'I quit education' from 'I'm moving to Arizona.'"

Once the true dropouts are recognized, it will enable the school to intervene.

- How are schools aligned building by building with the PA 25 core curriculum changes? And if they aren't, why is so much time being spent on school improvement teams and pub-

lished reports?

- What support services are available?

- What is the local operating millage and how is the district controlling that levy? Rezmierski suggested the report show a five-year history of millage rates.

- What is the student-teacher ratio, including support personnel?

- Include more data on staff. How many years experience? What kind of degrees do they hold? What kind of honors and achievements have they earned?

"There are a lot more effective ways to give credible information to the citizens which is honest to goodness information a parent wants to know... rather than simply knowing how much you make and what are your MEAP scores," Rezmierski said.

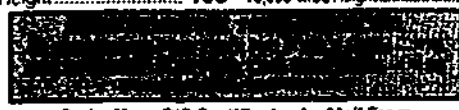

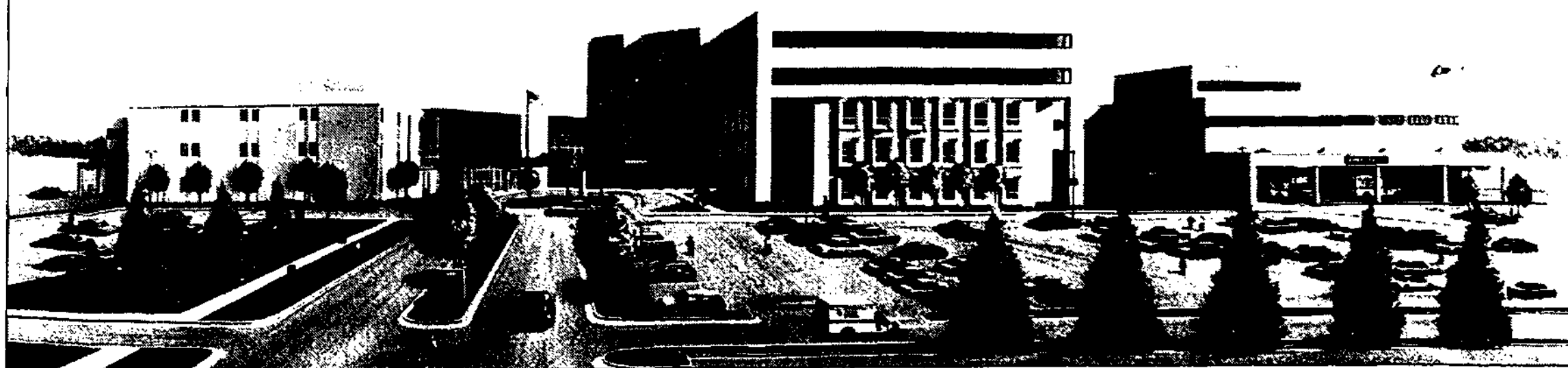

# Northville school report data lost

A funny thing happened to Northville schools' annual school report data on its way to the Michigan Department of Education. It got lost.

Well, maybe it wasn't that funny, but at least the district-level data did make it into the hands of Department of Education officials. Northville schools Superintendent Leonard Reznierski is still scratching his head over how individual building information was lost.

District-level data listed for Northville schools in the annual report include (based on 1991-92 school year figures):

- Finance index of \$187 (per pupil for each mill of tax)
- School tax in mills — 29.9
- Enrollment — 4,021 (High school, 1,157; Cooke Middle School, 447;

Meads Mill Middle School, 525; Moraine Elementary, 410; Winchester Elementary, 520; Silver Springs Elementary, 478; Amerman Elementary, 614).

- Staffing ratio — 124 (per 1,000 students).
- Expenditures — \$5,409 (dollar per pupil).
- Average salary — \$33,320.
- Average benefits — \$5,673.
- Dropout rate — .6 percent (percentage of students, grades 9-12, leaving school and not returning during the year. This is a one-year rate).
- "We have a good graduation completion rate," Reznierski said. "We have a good dropout rate — .6 percent. We'd like it to be zero, but reality gets in the way."
- Graduation completion rate — 97.6 percent (percentage of students who will complete the senior year of school and graduate).

The rest of the listings in the report are Michigan Educational Assessment Program (MEAP) scores.

"With the MEAP, we stand on the facts," Reznierski said.

Northville's MEAP scores have been among the highest in Wayne County and traditionally are well above state averages.

Reznierski said he was uncomfortable that the governor used the MEAP scores in the annual report.

"This is a comparison, that's not what MEAP was intended to do," he said, adding he feared MEAP scores will become a real estate issue. "Now all of a sudden this has become a score card."

When Northville officials look at the MEAP, they compare the numbers internally.

"What caused us to go up, what caused us to go down?" Reznierski asked. "There's no need for me to go

running around saying, 'look how good we are compared to...' That's grossly unfair."

From there, the district attempts to figure out a way to improve on its scores without "if you will, becoming fanatical. We don't want to get to the point where we teach to the test... That's not what this is about. This is about how we prepare kids as successful future learners."

Reznierski believes there were two reasons for the annual report card. One is a political move on the part of Gov. John Engler, who is pushing school finance reform.

The other reason was to provide parents with a guide to schools.

"I think it's to give information to citizens to make good choices about their school systems, to make good choices about where they send their kids to school," Reznierski said.

# Local group warns of oil company proposals

are pressuring homeowners to sign leases that relinquish their rights to the oil.

But what sounds good coming from the mouths of the leasing agents before leases are signed has failed to materialize afterwards, Chisnell said.

When agents come around to buy a homeowners' mineral rights, they promise residents royalties that turn out to be far less than what were promised at the lease signing, according to Chisnell.

Chisnell said she and neighbors of hers were approached by leasing agents five years ago. While several of her neighbors signed on, she checked the fine print.

The leasing agent who promised

her and others \$100 per acre, eventually only paid out \$88 by the time the note was processed. The lease agreement that was circulated in Chisnell's subdivision promised homeowners 1/4 of the profits. But what it didn't say is that the 1/4 figure is split between the homeowners who share in the 40-acre area necessary to start drilling operations.

And the kicker is that the lessor bears the costs to treat the oil, Chisnell said.

"Look out for what and who you are dealing with," she said. "When it was all said and done, it amounted to the cost of a cup of coffee a year."

"Anyone who agrees to it could also be held accountable for cleaning up contaminated sites," she said.

Chisnell and Andrikides have spearheaded NPA's efforts since leas-

ing agents first appeared in Northville and began asking residents for permission to drill in their neighborhoods for oil five and a half years ago. After the women heard the agents' pitch, they began researching the environmental and economic impact residential drilling would have on township residents and on property values.

What they found was surprising and frightening if the 250 oil and gas companies that are active in Michigan were to have their way with township residents. If drilling companies manage to find an active well here, residents could be exposed to the increased potential for spills, fires, explosions, noxious odors and air pollution, they said.

There's also an increase for surface water and soil contamination and for the release of hydrogen sulfide at the well head.

Even though NPA once had far more members than it does today, Chisnell and Andrikides are still committed to finding a way to stop oil and gas companies from ripping up land in Northville Township.

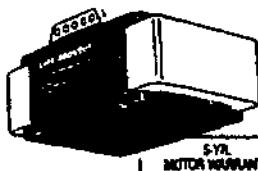

# DDA reviews Mainstreet '93 parking deck plan

DDA members also asked about the design of the two decks. While they will be similar, said Rich & Associates' Matt Jobim, the Center Street deck will take some styling cues off the MainCentre building while the rebuilt Cady deck will incorporate some design elements from Singh Development's proposed CadyCentre commercial/office structure between the deck and Center Street.

DDA member Jim Long asked whether any consideration has been

given to moving the Cady deck's Cady Street exit, now located toward the west end of the deck, further east to avoid traffic congestion at Center. Jobim said the change still could be made.

Allen asked whether the new deck could be built on the site of the proposed 140- to 160-space parking lot on the south side of Cady. Jobim noted that a new deck built there would require a ramp since the terrain there is not as steeply sloped as that between Cady and Mary Alexander Court.

DDA members also asked about the possibility of changing the direction of Mary Alexander Court in connection with the new Cady deck. Rich & Associates had mapped out an eastbound traffic flow on Mary Alexander to end the problem of cross-traffic at the entrance to the new deck.

"I think we need to think about a reversal," said Mayor Chris Johnson. He added that the possibility should be considered by a board like the city planning commission along with a traffic study of the entire area, to re-

view ways that traffic flow through downtown Northville could be improved.

Most of the questions Tuesday morning concerned the new Center Street deck. DDA member Greg Presley noted that historic district commission members had balked at the deck's location at the edge of the sidewalk along Center, which created "a hard deck coming right down to a hard surface."

"I think that their point is well taken," Presley said. "Any attempt we can make to soften that deck would be good."

The remark prompted Long to again ask whether the deck could be moved 60 feet to the west to soften its appearance and leave the land along Center available for commercial redevelopment.

Jobim noted that such a move

would cost the city an additional \$140,000 to \$160,000 in excavation costs to make up for the lack of slope, mechanical ventilation to make up for the fact that the lower level of the deck would be almost buried, and a longer pedestrian bridge between the deck and MainCentre.

He added that such a pedestrian bridge would stand out more than the current proposal, and noted that the historic district commission had asked for as unobtrusive a bridge as possible.

Long restated his desire to see the city retain that land for commercial redevelopment, saying, "\$145,000 over 15 years isn't a lot of money, and I think we're making a big mistake putting a parking structure on a main thoroughfare." Mainstreet '93 would be financed by a 15-year bond.

Allen agreed with Long and went

further, noting that the entire strip of land between Center and Wing south to Seven Mile Road could be turned into a commercial corridor, which would allow plenty of room for commercial buildings and parking.

Allen, a former mayor, said Wing Street was originally built to allow more commercial development along Center with parking behind it, like that along North Center and Main streets.

"There isn't a person down there that wouldn't be glad to sell their property" for redevelopment, he said.

City Manager Gary Word instructed Jobim to redesign the Center Street deck to allow part of the deck to be removed in the future for commercial redevelopment. The deck's design does include an elevator and stair tower at the north end that could not be removed.

## AAA offers safety tips for travelers

Concern for the security of travelers has prompted AAA Michigan to offer "Playing It Safe," a free self-help brochure on traveler safety to the public. The six-page brochure provides tips for safety on the road, at accommodations and sightseeing.

"Crime is a fact of life throughout the world and travelers are not immune," said Community Services Manager Jerry Basch. "While few people are confronted by safety problems on a trip, those who prepare wisely can help ensure a worry-free and enjoyable vacation."

Basch cited two key factors in successful trip planning: First, make sure your vehicle is in top operating condition, and second, thoroughly plan your route in advance.

Other travel security tips:

- Keep your car doors locked and windows up.
- Drive on well-traveled roads or streets.
- Avoid high-crime areas.
- Travel during daylight hours.
- Use well-lit convenience stores, gas stations, or other establishments frequented by the public.
- Use a cellular phone, if possible, for emergency calls.

For travelers using a rental vehicle, special conditions apply. Basch recommends choosing a car rental company that doesn't use stickers or other obvious rental company identification (including special license plates) on its vehicles. Some states have special laws which require rental-car license plates to begin with a Y or Z.

If your vehicle is struck deliberately, stay inside and lock the doors if you have not already done so. Don't get out to inspect damages. Instead, motion to the other driver to follow you, then drive to a well-lit, public area and contact the police. If you have a cellular phone, dial 911 or 0 and request police assistance.

"In most cases, common sense is a very valuable tool when seeking to avoid potentially dangerous situations," said Basch. "We urge all travelers — even those familiar with their surroundings — to 'play it safe' and take necessary precautions."

economically viable.

Willer was also disturbed that developers were adhering to minimum lot sizes spelled out in a consent judgment handed down by a Wayne County Circuit Court judge last summer. The judgment established the density of the development and minimum lot sizes of 70 feet in width and 120 feet in depth.

Willer argued that the court order established minimum lot sizes, but didn't mandate that the minimums were the only option.

"I don't think you have shown any reason why we should have smaller lots," he said before casting his vote. "It could have been a beautiful

development."

Commission Chairman Dick Allen appeared angry at the outset of the plan's discussion because he said developers didn't seem open to compromise even though one of the lots was 8-10 feet shy of the minimum lot size imposed by the court.

It was Allen who made the first offer to meet developers half way with his willingness to ease front and rear setbacks if developers agreed to delete three lots from the plan.

The developers balked at the offer and failed to consider it, which set Allen off.

"Let's cut out three lots and then we'll consider front and rear setbacks," he offered. "... We are talking variances on all levels. But I'm

talking concessions — not a total concession but a partial one to reach a compromise."

"People in the township want to see open space," he said. "You can cheat a little in the front and in the back, but when they (homes) are sardined together, it shows."

At first developers disregarded Allen's offer and agreed to consider dropping lots later in the development process, but after a 10-minute caucus they returned with a counter offer.

Their offer dropped the lot Allen was questioning and another to use the additional space for the expansion of the other. The remaining provisions were agreed to in the list of conditions.

As the holidays approach activity at the Village will slow and with the slowing this column will return to some of the community's earlier history. Mill Race Village sits on the site of Northville's first business, a grist mill built by John Miller in 1827. When Miller built his mill there were only about five farms in what is today the city of Northville. Early settlers besides Miller were Daniel Cady, Hiram Robinson, William Yerkes, Joseph Yerkes, and the Welsh family. By 1831 today's downtown began to develop.

The Mead Brothers, later of Waterford, built a store. John Sterling kept the first public house (bar), William Hickock ran a blacksmith shop. Also in 1831 Miller sold his mill to William Dunlap and moved farther south in the township. Dunlap expanded the mill, built a larger home for his family of six, and began to subdivide on his southern property line (Main Street).

As Dunlap divided so did Cady whose Northern property line was Main Street. This selling off of lots created the Northville downtown area we know today. Next week more on Mill Race.

Smith ran the Goodfellows Drive and remained active in Civic Concern until his death at the age of 91.

The money goes to pay for the food that Civic Concern distributes twice a month and to the emergency payments the organization makes when people face eviction or the shut-off of their utilities.

"Without them, we couldn't do it," she said.

### More responsibility needed at larger club

Wooly Bully's owner Mark Roman has had a rough go of it. Since opening his successful restaurant/rock 'n' roll diner last March, Roman has made more enemies than a mobster engaged in a turf war.

First, he became the target of much ire when residents found the facade of his building a bit too outlandish for the predominantly conservative tastes of the local constituency.

Then he found himself locked in battle with Highland Lakes Center owner Bill Autry over parking privileges at the Seven Mile Road plaza the two men share. That feud went on for months and at one point escalated into an almost mortal struggle between the two belligerents. A Wayne County judge has seen a lot of Roman and Autry this year.

Now, Northville Township trustee and planning commissioner Russ Fogg, a resident of a neighborhood adjacent to Wooly's, is making life miserable for the entrepreneur. Fogg wrote a criticism of Roman in *The Highland Lakes Herald*, a neighborhood newsletter, and reportedly ordered township officials early one morning to enforce an ordinance against sandwich board signs, one of which stood in front of the night club at the time.

Through it all, Roman has maintained his commitment to his Northville Township business and we hope he continues to invest in the local community.

But while we believe that Wooly Bully's impact on the Northville-area economy is generally a positive one, we would hope Roman would begin to show greater sensitivity to the corner in which he is, quite literally, trying to carve out a niche for himself.

Specifically, Roman has shown little appreciation for the environment in the vicinity between his building and the railroad tracks, an area in which he has been permitted to expand both his parking lot and, following action by the planning commission Tuesday, his club's seating capacity.

In seeking permits to add parking



spaces and an outdoor serving deck at the west end of his property, Roman went before the planning commission with an unreasonable proposal that would have required numerous variances. After being rebuffed, he returned to the commission with a scaled-down plan, this time receiving approval.

But when it came time for the work to be done, Roman allowed his subcontractor to rip down five protected trees, aged and dignified woodies that members of the beautification committee feared might be jeopardized by development in that corner. The planning commission has ordered him to plant nine replacement seedlings, but nothing can be done to save the trees that were lost to the bulldozer's shovel.

We think the establishment of Wooly Bully's has been a boon for Northville Township and we hope the business continues to thrive and draw patrons from all over the metropolitan area.

But we feel, too, that the peacemeal manner in which planning for the club has proceeded has represented a case of putting a jigsaw puzzle together with a sledge hammer. Few of the problems that have developed, it seems, were anticipated or adequately prepared for.

Wooly Bully's is here now and we wouldn't have it any other way. But we urge owner Mark Roman to show restraint in his future expansion plans and make good on the conditions the planning commission placed on approval of his deck: namely, that no dancing be allowed outside, that the noise level be kept under control and that the deck must close at 10 o'clock.

It's time for a voluntary good neighbor policy to take precedence over considerations of profit.

## What's next for the paper?

We're still experiencing the fallout from the decision to discontinue the Monday editions of *The Northville Record* and *The Novi News*.

After a 3 1/2 year experiment with a bi-weekly format, company brass announced last month that reader and advertiser acceptance never materialized and that there was no point throwing good money after bad.

A number of changes are in the works from the move and nobody's sure at this stage just where the chips will fall.

In the Nov. 29 paper, the last Monday to be published (at least for the foreseeable future), we asked readers to call or write us with their suggestions about the future direction of the Thursday paper. Should we do anything different now that we can put all our resources into one edition per week? Is there anything from the Monday that should survive the cut?

Perhaps not surprisingly, the majority of calls we've received have come from readers unhappy about the prospect of losing the Cable/TV Weekly that came as an insert with the Monday paper. Some of our subscribers don't get the hybrid weekend Free Press/News, and rely on our guide to tell them what's on the 23,454 channels they get on their television sets.

Happily, the wise old owls at corporate responded to these

pleas and arranged to make copies of the guides available free of charge. As today's front-page blurb indicates, people who need a guide will be able to stop in at the downtown Northville office and pick one up, no questions asked. It's that simple.

Another change that's in the works is a little more complicated. As a result of the Monday cancellation, one of our reporters became surplus property. We had to part with a staffer and Tina Ferrier, formerly our B-section editor and Novi police reporter, volunteered to be transferred to our sister publication, *The Milford Times*, which was one reporter short of a full complement.

She follows Rick Byrne in making the trek westward. Rick, who used to be our copy editor, got bumped up to the editorship of *The Times* after ex-Milford chief Matt Valley took a job with the *The Battle Creek Enquirer*.

The loss of a reporter and our copy editor (that slot won't be filled) forced a change in the "beat" assignments among the remaining staff in the Northville/Novi office. The beats have been reconfigured, with new combinations drawn up and different reporters named in some of the cases. Careful readers will notice a few new by-lines on the stories pertaining to their favorite areas of interest; public officials can look for some new faces at certain board meetings.

Change can be good — there's a certain sense of nervous expectation that comes with it. What won't change, though, is our commitment to provide a product that's responsive to community needs. That's a constant, regardless of how many times a week we go to press.

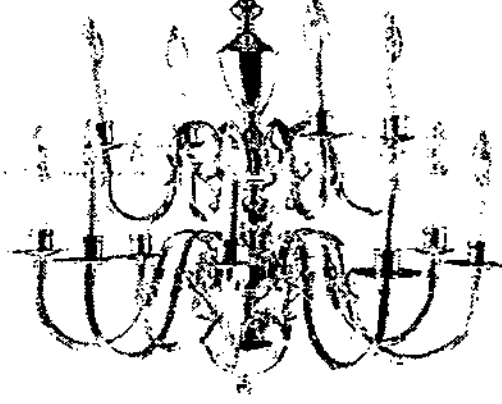

# Coverups should be against the law

denied tenure as a coach and teacher. He said one principal pressured him to use the principal's son offener on the junior varsity basketball team.

The case apparently was settled out of court. A reporter called Harkrader's home to find out what happened. No comment. Can't talk.

Typically, when a governmental or big business defendant pays off, it requires that the plaintiff, as a condition of payment, agree to keep the terms a secret and seek a court order to seal the casefile.

That hurts the public. We as voters and taxpayers can't learn how badly our public officials are screwing up and misusing our tax money.

In 1989 John Briggs III sued Upjohn Co., maker of Halcion, in Muskegon because the drug's side effects were a factor in his attempted suicide and resulting maiming. Briggs' attorney, Richard Toth of Southfield, engaged

in a process called "discovery" to probe Upjohn's records. The parties agreed Briggs' side would return the 2,500 pages of documents when the case was over unless the trial judge found "need and good cause." Upjohn contended the documents contained trade secrets.

Toth later asked the court to set aside the deal because the documents pertained to "the means and methods employed by (Upjohn) to obtain (Food and Drug Administration) approval for the marketing of Halcion in the United States, defendant's knowledge of the health risks associated with Halcion, and defendant's strategies for marketing Halcion in such ways as to minimize publication of these risks."

Toth said his clients "did not find any documents to disclose secret formulas or manufacturing information, nor any information which would assist a competitor of Upjohn in either manufacturing or marketing a Halcion type drug."

Toth argued that the documents had information of "vital public interest to consumers" that would assist others who had suffered injury from Halcion.

I hear the Upjohn line a lot. Companies often ask that the Freedom of Information Act be damaged so they can hide "sensitive financial information" or "trade secrets." I strongly suspect the companies are lying. Certainly I've never heard a concrete example of what constitutes "sensitive" information.

Well, Upjohn won 2 to 1 in the state Court of Appeals last June. Judge Clifford Taylor took the narrow view that a deal is a deal, and that the trial judge failed to review the documents before lifting the gag order. Taylor and E. Thomas Fitzgerald said nary a word about health risks.

As I said, there ought to be a law. In Lansing, Rep. Michael Griffin, D-Jackson, addressed half the problem with House Bill 4577. Applied to governmental units, it says any deal to settle a claim or suit "that prohibits disclosure of the agreement or any terms of the agreement is against public policy and void."

Rep. David Gubow, D-Huntington Woods, sought to amend the law by making the bill apply to all suits, not just those against governments. Five Republicans and one Democrat shot down Gubow's amendment in the House Judiciary Committee.

Gubow was right because:

■ Upjohn is a publicly traded stock. This writer owns shares and would appreciate knowing how management erred. Certainly the fine print of annual reports casts little light on lawsuits.

■ Others who believe they were harmed by Halcion shouldn't have to repeat the expensive "discovery" process that Briggs went through. We need a law to prevent court ordered coverups.

# New House legislative plan prompts questions

Answers to readers' questions about the latest public school finance plan by the House bipartisan team:

**Q.** Would home sales still be taxed?

**A.** Yes. For years the tax has been \$1.10 per \$1,000 of value. The tax got attention when, on Oct. 5, Gov. John Engler proposed to raise it to \$40. The House team of 14 proposes to raise it by \$10 to \$11.10.

**Q.** As a parent, I'm concerned about restoring funding per-pupil. How much will the property tax change in

my district?

**A.** Under the House team plan, all 562 school districts would be able to levy 16 mills on homestead property or face a cutoff of state aid.

The caller lives in one of 35 relatively wealthy districts that would have to levy additional millage to restore current funding. Most are in southern Oakland County or on Great Lakes shorelines. Their funding wouldn't be fully restored unless voters agreed to the additional millages. Here are the data for the Home-Town Newspapers' area:

**Novi** — now levies 29.43, would be cut to 16, would be allowed to seek 3.11 for a total of 19.11 — a net cut of 10.32.

**Northville** — now levies 29.49, would be cut to 16, would be allowed to seek 0.19 for a total of 16.19 — a net cut of 13.3.

In Livingston County, no district would be allowed to vote extra millage to restore funding.

**Q.** Why do renters receive a \$40 million income tax break under this plan?

**A.** House Taxation Committee co-chair Willis Bullard Jr., R-Milford, replied:

Nobody believes landlords will reduce rent when their property taxes are cut. Under the homestead credit portion of the income tax, 17 percent of rent is deemed to be the renters'

share of property tax.

The cut is designed to give renters a break and is expected to induce renters to support whatever constitutional amendment might be placed on the ballot.

At this writing, the bill containing the renter benefit had not been drafted.

**Q.** Is the homestead credit left intact?

**A.** Yes, but it will be reduced because property taxes will be reduced. Rep. Lyn Bankes, R-Redford, said the cost of rebates to the state will plummet from the current \$800 million to \$80 million.

The homestead credit — alias the

"circuit breaker" — is a state income tax rebate you get when your homestead property taxes exceed 3.5 percent of income. For senior citizens, the rebate is 100 percent of the excess; for others, 60 percent.

**Q.** Will pensions of retired governmental workers be taxed?

**A.** Not under this proposal, said Bullard. Gov. Engler's proposal would have required a tax after Jan. 1, 1994, but "we can't get it out of committee. Democrats won't give it a single vote."

He added: "My pension, the governor's pension and teachers' pensions are not taxed. It's not fair."

**Q.** Under the House team proposal, districts that spend \$5,000 to \$6,500 would get a 3 percent increase in the 1994-95 school year. Three percent of what — of spending or revenue? Around here (Livingston County), many districts dipped into their fund balances (bank accounts) to balance their budgets this year. So their spending is higher than their revenue.

**A.** Bullard says there has been a lot of argument on this point, but so far the prevailing view is that it should be a percentage of revenue.

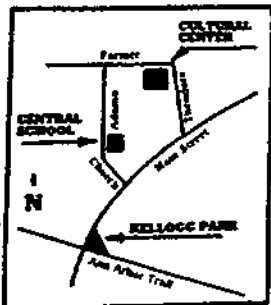

# Legislators attempt to disband MEA's insurance monopoly

Backers of the Michigan Education Association say its health insurance operation is superior to those of commercial insurers.

The battleground is a state Senate panel considering bills requiring school districts to buy health insurance on the basis of competitive bids. The bills, by Sen. Jack Welborn, R-Kalamazoo, are aimed at breaking up the alleged monopoly of MESSA (Michigan Education Special Services Association).

"Commercial carriers would skim the good risks and leave us the bad risks," said Dale Robertson, a lobbyist for Blue Cross and Blue Shield, which is allied with MEA against the bills.

"Our competitors compete by avoiding risks. They cherry pick. But this puts us (MESSA and Blues) at a competitive disadvantage because we cover a lot of groups. It's spread across geography."

But Welborn and Sen. Gil DiNello, R-Macomb County, seem determined to push the bills as a method of cutting school costs, an idea supported by Gov. John Engler. Sen. William Faust, D-Westland, is a member of the subcommittee but has missed both sessions.

It works like this: MEA units bargain with school districts, not only for health care benefits but over who will be the third party administrator. MEA's choice is MESSA, its own subsidiary. Although school districts pay the premiums, MESSA handles the

money and is the policyholder. MESSA buys mostly from the Blues, a non-profit corporation not covered by state insurance laws. About two-thirds of Michigan public school employees are covered by MESSA health care contracts.

The Blues and MEA oppose Welborn's bill to make them reveal their loss experience, including claims exceeding \$5,000.

MESSA refuses to release its loss experience by school district, as Robertson said, because it calculates on the basis of broad geographic regions, not bargaining units, and covers everyone.

As Blues vice president Paul Austin explained: "In health care, if you can eliminate 3 percent of the high risks, you can lower the cost (premium) by 50 percent. . . . We don't differentiate between good and bad risks. . . . MESSA doesn't experience rate (individual districts). It spreads the risk over a larger pool."

"We don't vary rates by age and gender. We take all comers," added Blues vice president Bob Kaspersek. DiNello, the former Democrat who now battles with organized labor, said many elected school boards are composed of "seven weaklings who don't have the guts to stand up to the MEA."

Kevin Harty, a Lansing attorney for school boards, said "not many" MEA units have struck over the MESSA, but there have been teacher "slowdowns" during bargaining in support of MESSA. Harty said MEA has been unable to motivate its members with any other issue as much as

MESSA. Asked by Welborn if school boards had raised "slowdowns" as an unfair labor practice by the union, Harty said, "Most of our clients don't want to spend the money chasing down something for which there's no remedy."

Asked if he ever had seen a contract between the Blues and MESSA, Harty said no because "they said it's a trade secret."

Supporting the bills, Tom White, lobbyist for the Michigan Association of School Boards, said requiring MESSA and the Blues to reveal loss experience would "level the playing field" between them and commercial insurers.

White cited a case where MESSA used excess reserves to increase a benefit from \$1 million to \$2 million instead of reducing the premium to the school district and its taxpayers.

"Has any school district ever received a rebate?" asked Welborn. "There may be," said White, "but I'm not aware of any."

Engler raised the MESSA issue in his Oct. 5 address on education reform. Some politicians estimate that with competitive bidding, school districts could save as much as \$1,000 per employee or \$100 million.

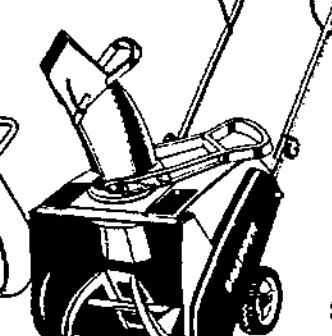
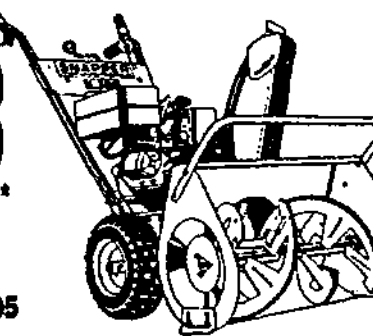

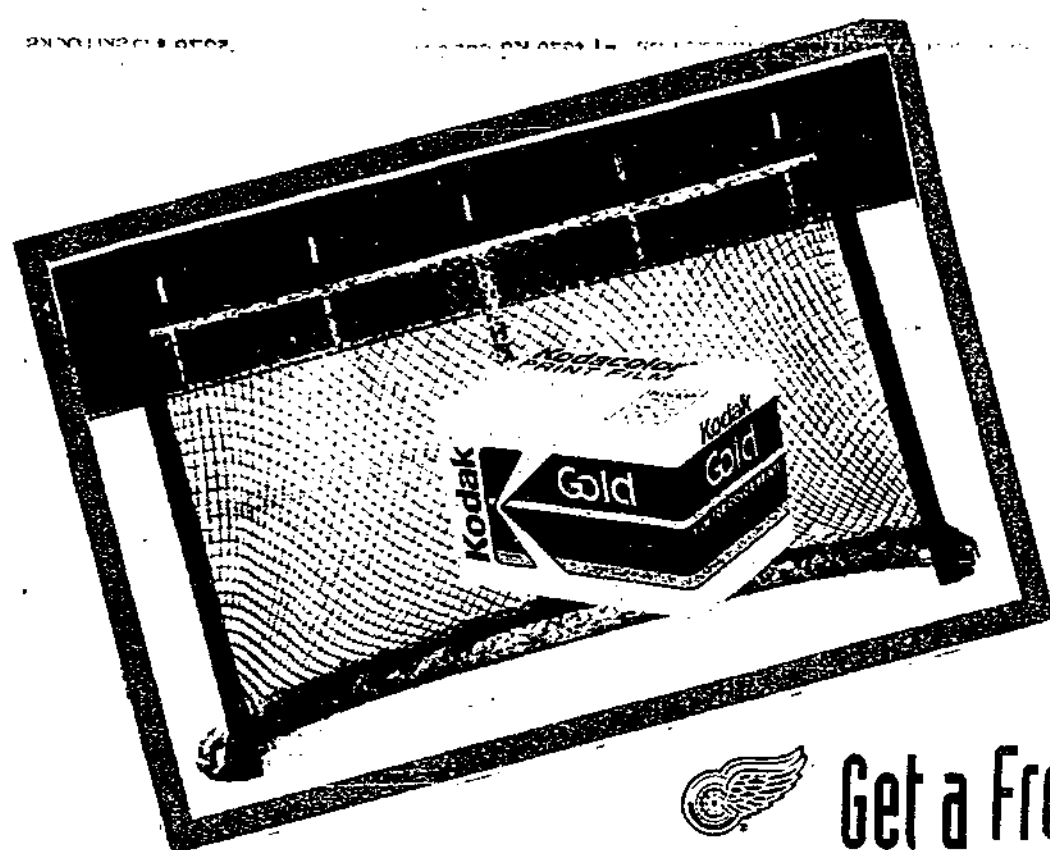

# Safety is key to happier holiday happenings

A good holiday theme this year, and every year, is safety. Just a few minutes checking electric holiday decorations will provide peace of mind during this festive time.

Before stringing lights and setting up other trimmings, make sure electrical decorations have safety listings from Underwriters Laboratories, said Claudia Gabay, Detroit Edison's corporate lighting consultant.

The "UL" designation ensures that the set has been designed for safe operation, Gabay said. She added that lights should be used as intended by

the manufacturer — either outdoor or indoor.

"Faulty lights can cause electrical shock or start a fire," Gabay said. "We want everybody to have a safe holiday, and the best way to do that is to check for frayed wires, damaged sockets and cracked or missing insulation. If there are defects, the entire set should be replaced."

Decorative lighting can be a safe, inexpensive way to kindle the holiday spirit, Gabay said. She said most

lights cost from less than 1 cent to 7.5 cents per string to operate for six hours, depending on wattage. And for strands of lights that blink off and on, the cost is halved.

Gabay offered the following suggestions for a safer holiday season:

**Indoor Lighting**  
 ■ Do not overload electrical circuits. Older home circuits usually cannot safely carry more than 15 amperes or 1,800 watts, with newer homes able

to carry more than 20 amperes or 2,400 watts. For best results, load to only 80 percent of your home's maximum capacity.

■ Do not leave cords hanging from table edges.  
 ■ Use no more than three sets of standard lights on each extension cord.  
 ■ Do not insert new bulbs or change fuses when light sets are plugged in.  
 ■ Keep lights away from carpeting, furniture and drapes. Some stan-


dard lights produce enough heat to scorch or damage items they touch.  
 ■ Do not put the tree near an active fireplace.  
 ■ Turn off decorative lights before you go to bed or leave home.

**Outdoor lighting**  
 ■ Use only outdoor extension cords with molded plugs and sockets.  
 ■ Place cords where people cannot trip over them.  
 ■ Keep all electrical connections off the ground and hang sockets down-

ward to prevent water from seeping into them.

■ Fasten extension cords or light sets to wood or hardboard surfaces with insulated staples; never use nails or tacks because they may pierce the wires and cause shocks or shorts.  
 ■ Cover outdoor plugs and connection joints with plastic wrap and seal the ends with electrical tape.  
 ■ Do not run lighting cords through door or window openings where they can be damaged.

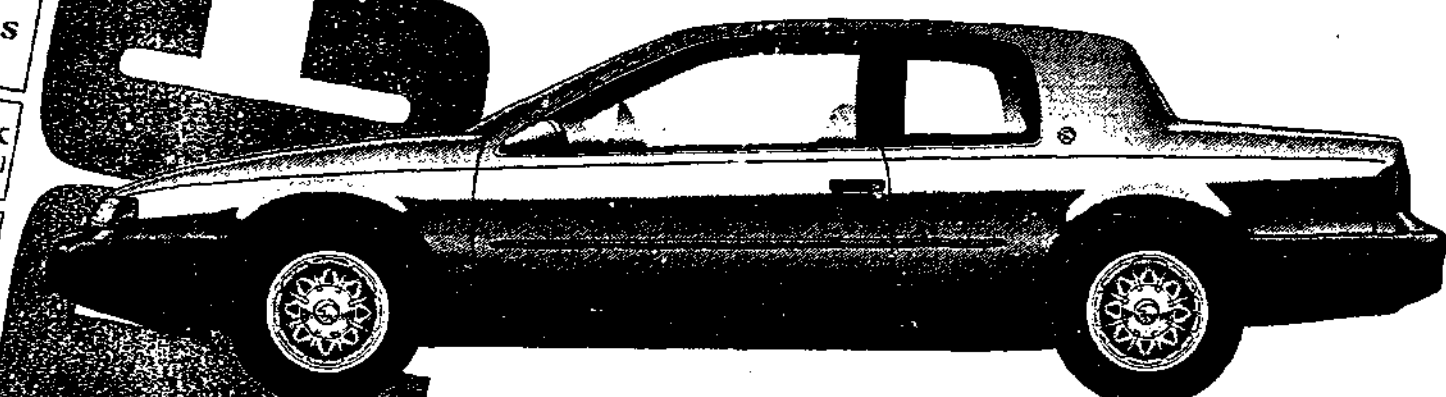

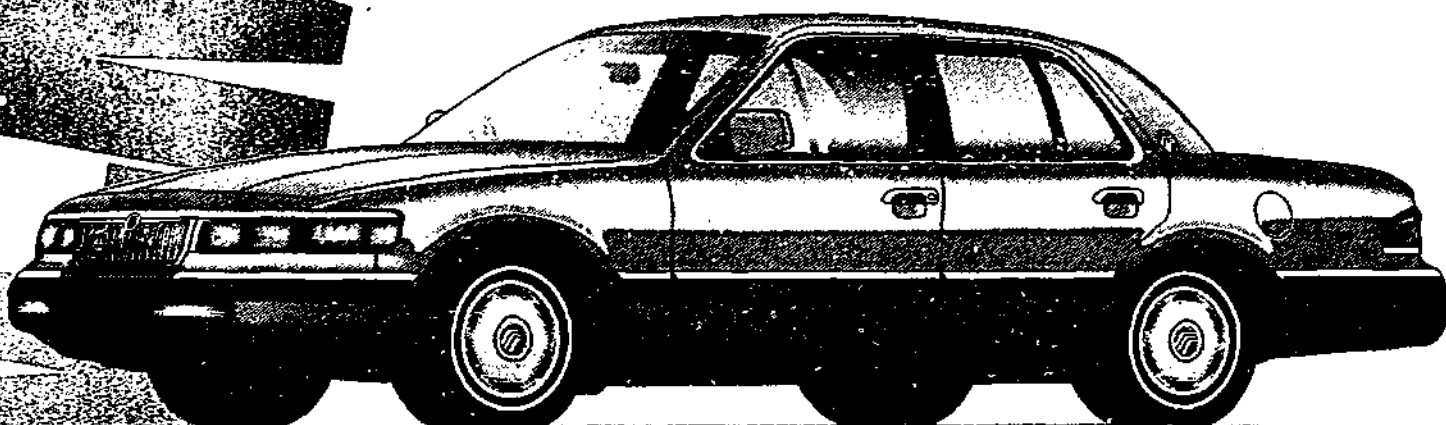

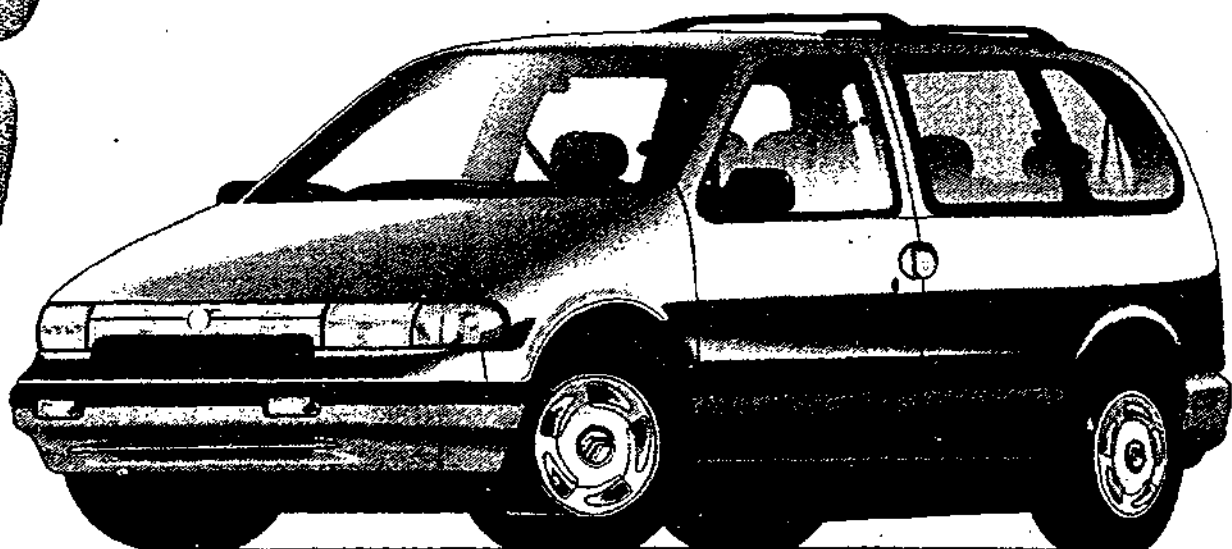

## TANNENBAUM TIMBER

Snow is dusting the ground, Christmas decorations are up around town, and it's time to get that Christmas tree.

And this year the trend continues: more and more families are going to tree farms to choose and cut down their own tree, instead of buying one that is pre-cut.

The many tree farms and nurseries within a short drive are geared up and ready for the season, and anticipate a brisk business in tree sales this year.

One of the most popular methods of selecting the family Christmas tree is to cut your own, and cut-and-carry tree farms abound in Oakland and Livingston Counties.

The closest to home is the Novi Parks and Recreation's new "cut your own" Christmas trees at the city's newest park on 12-1/2 Mile Road, west of Novi Road near Dixon Road.

This Christmas tree farm, recently purchased by the city with park bond funds, backs up to Lakeshore Park and has natural hiking trails, deer and other wildlife, as well as Christmas trees including pines (Austrian, Eastern White and Scotch), firs (Douglas and White) and spruce (Colorado Blue and White).

The sizes range from 5-12 feet. The original \$35 price tag to cut any tree has been lowered to \$30. Haywagons are on hand to haul the tree back to the car. Saws, rope and twine are available free of charge.

There will also be some pre-cut for sale at prices ranging from \$15-\$25. Hot cocoa and coffee will be available, and proceeds from all tree sales will be used for future park improvements.

The Christmas tree sales begin Saturday, Dec. 4 and last until Sunday, Dec. 19. Hours are: Saturdays (Dec. 4, 11, 18) from 9 a.m. — 4:30 p.m. and Thursdays (Dec. 9, 16) and Fridays (Dec. 10, 17) from noon to 4:30 p.m.

Two other nearby cut-your-own Christmas tree farms include the Broadway and Huff Christmas Tree Farms, both in Highland Township.

At Broadway, the search for a tree begins with a wagon ride through the fields, located off Hickory Ridge Road.

Bill Brian, one of the family members who owns and operates Broadway, said customers are given a wagon ride into the tree farm which covers 100 acres. Among the 115,000 trees in the ground, Brian said 3,400 are ready for sale. The others have not reached the proper growth stage to be sold.

When it gets real busy, Brian said two wagons are pulled by the tractor. The ride takes about 20 minutes.

"It's one of those things an entire family

can do together," he said.

Brian said business has been fairly steady at the farm. But with increasing competition, he said there has been a small decrease in the number of people coming to their farm.

But he added that there are more people going out these days and chopping down fresh trees for Christmas.

"It continues to be a popular thing," he said.

Trees available at Broadway include Scotch and Austrian pine which sell for \$25, and spruce for \$30 to \$32. Trees for table-tops are also available for \$8. There are also pre-cut Douglas fir trees for those not interested in chopping their own.

Another place for fresh Christmas trees is the Huff tree farm, located on Wardlow Road.

Ludmilla Huff and her husband, Richard, started planting trees at the farm in 1955 and sold the first batch in 1961. When Richard died 20 years ago, she kept the business going on her own. Now her two daughters, Lois and Cathy, and her son David help manage the business.

Huff said they have about 20,000 trees on 100 acres that are available for cutting. The trees range from five to 15 feet.

Huff said walking around a field and looking for a Christmas tree provides people with a chance to just get away for 3-4 hours and be outside. Families spend time together and can be out in nature again.

Trees available are Scotch pine at \$4.50 per foot and Douglas fir at \$5.50 per foot. Blue spruce and Fraser fir are also available.

Other options, besides the artificial route, include purchasing cut or potted live trees. The Michigan Christmas Tree Association offers the following tips for purchasing cut trees:

- Check for freshness by bending the needles. They should be very supple, not brittle.

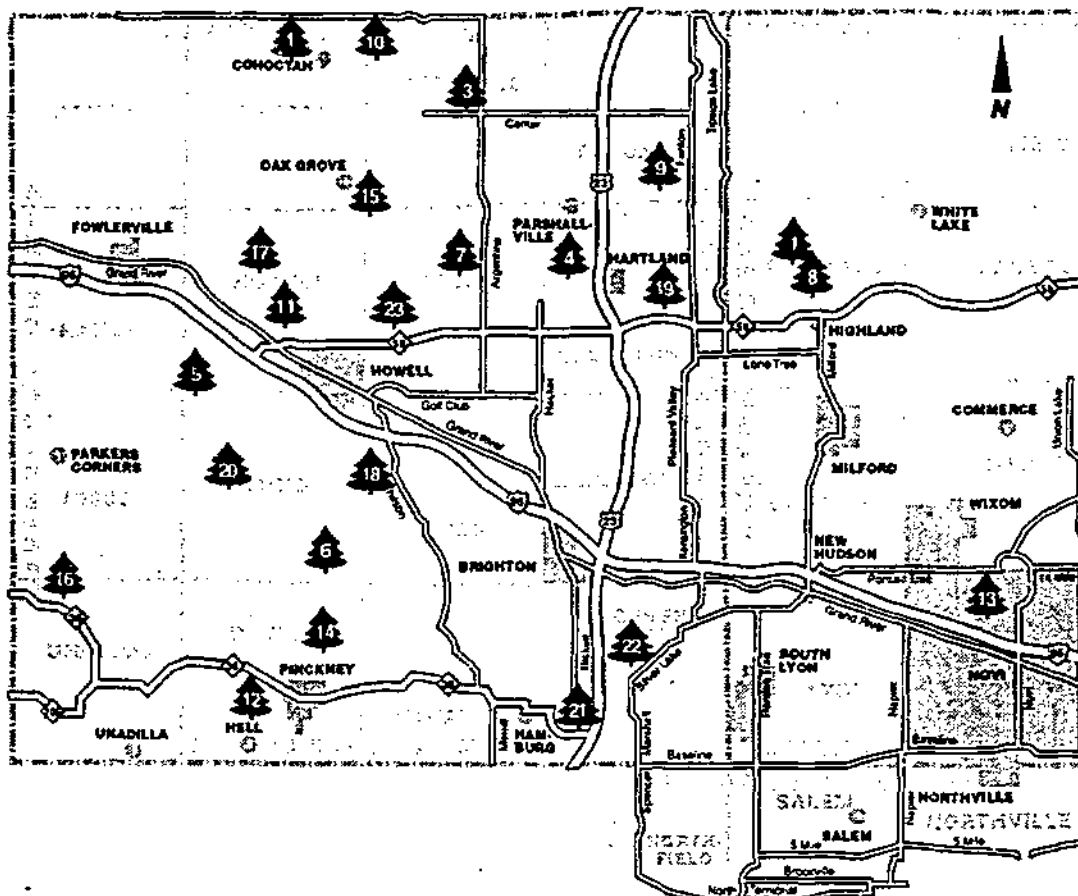
- Stomp the tree on the ground. A few needles should fall, but be wary of excessive needle droppage.

- Look for a fairly straight trunk for ease in placing the tree in a stand.

A number of tree farm owners say Fraser firs are gaining in popularity and are among the best choices for cut trees.

"Fraser firs are among the cut trees we sell," said Frank Lepek of Lepek Nursery and Garden Center in Brighton. "They are soft and shiny and are very heavy plants — there is lots of water in the leaf and the needles hold better than other trees."

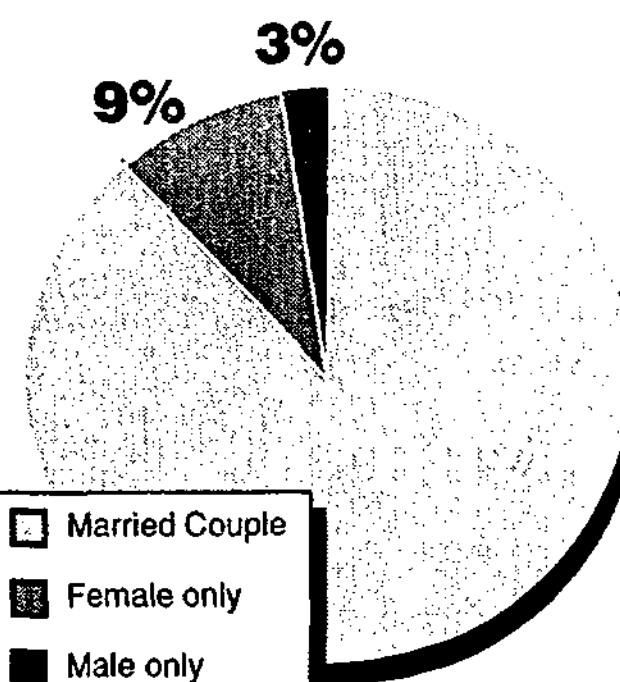
"I'm active in the Finance Committee," he said. "We meet six times a year for the purpose of raising funds for scholarships and special needs."

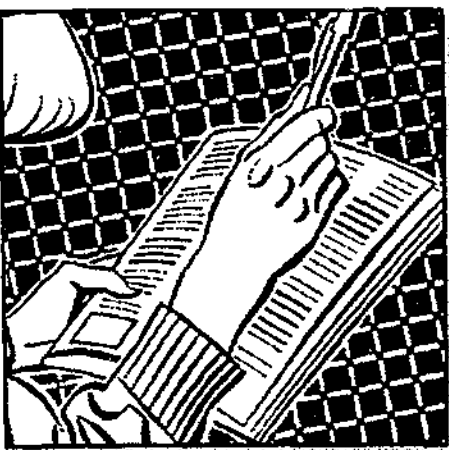

## Family Leave Act info available

The Michigan Women's Commission has developed a brochure describing the features of the newly-enacted federal Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA) of 1993.

Brochures are currently available to the public at large and serve as an explanation of the FMLA for both employers and employees. Specifically, the brochure outlines important aspects of the FMLA, including who is eligible, requirements of employers and employees, and enforcement.

FMLA was signed into law on Feb. 5 and went into effect Aug. 5 for non-

unionized employers. Those with union contracts will be covered by the law on Feb. 5, 1994, or upon termination of their contracts, whichever is earlier.

"The Commission is extremely pleased that the Family Medical Leave Act has now gone into effect. This new law will have tremendous impact on Americans in that they will no longer have to choose between job security and family responsibilities when faced with medical problems," said Evelyn Crane, vice chair of the Michigan Women's Commission.

"Citizens will now have the opportunity to blend work and family together in such a way that they will be protected from any additional losses during the event of a disabling medical condition," stated Barbara Cable, chair of the Michigan Women's Commission Employment Standing Committee.

## Cut-your-own tree farms anticipate brisk business

"Freshness will not be an issue if you purchase your tree on a farm," the association says. Quality farms should offer trees with a pleasing shape that are full on at least three sides. In addition, the tree field should be clean of tall weeds and easy to walk through.

"An increasingly popular alternative to purchasing a tree that ultimately will be disposed of is to choose a live potted or "balled" tree. These trees are generally smaller than most cut trees and can be planted in the ground when the holidays are over. The roots are kept in a "ball" of earth and wrapped in burlap or set into a biodegradable container.

Live trees account for one-third of the Christmas tree sales each year at Leppek Nursery and Garden Center, Leppek said.

"We have a certain clientele looking for live trees, and they come back year after year," Leppek said. "Most want a spruce of some sort and they pick them out early so they can get a hole dug (before the ground freezes)."

It's OK to pick out the tree early, but it should not be put inside the house and decorated until a week or so before Christmas, Leppek

cautioned.

"It should be inside a week to 10 days at the most, because once it's inside the tree thinks it's spring and breaks dormancy," he explained. "The fluids begin to flow and once it's outside again the tips freeze."

Because indoor air is drier, the live tree should be hand-misted regularly or sprayed with a plastic sealant that holds the moisture in the leaves.

Leppek doesn't guarantee the trees because he doesn't know for sure how they are treated once they go home, he said. He gets one or two calls each spring or summer informing him a live Christmas tree has died, he added.

"But we give customers an instruction sheet when they purchase the tree, and if they follow the instructions, and don't keep the tree in the house too long, it should be OK," he said.

Cost of a cut tree varies from \$20-\$100, depending on size, and the trees range in size from 24 inches to 7 feet.

If you purchase a live tree and dig its outdoor hole early, the hole should be filled with mulch to prevent freezing and remain covered until it's time to plant, according to the National Christmas Tree Asso-

ciation.

Until it is brought into the house for Christmas, the live tree should be stored in an unheated, sheltered area, such as a garage or porch and it should not be exposed to freezing temperatures.

When removing the tree after Christmas, it should again be placed in a sheltered area for a few days so it can re-acclimate itself to cooler temperatures.

When planting the tree, the burlap and soil surrounding the root system should stay intact. After the hole around the root ball is backfilled, a heavy layer of mulch should be placed over the root ball to keep it from freezing.

Whether you choose a cut tree or a live tree this year, area nurseries and tree farms, as well as other retailers selling cut trees, are ready and waiting for you.

## Residents go solo with DSO

Ask Northville resident Bob Williams if he thinks his job is glamorous and he'll laugh.

"I wouldn't call it glamorous. It's a lot of work," said Williams, principal bassoonist with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra (DSO).

"I spend half my time making reeds for the bassoon and the other half of my time in rehearsals."

Then there's the four to five concerts per week at Orchestra Hall, like the one coming up tonight.

Williams and Novi resident, Patti Masri-Fletcher, will be featured soloists with the DSO Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

Masri-Fletcher has been practicing Mozart's "Concerto for Flute and Harp in C major, K. 297c," since March with flutist Ervin Monroe. Williams will play Mozart's "Bassoon Concerto in B-Flat Major, K. 297c."

Williams, a University of Arizona grad, joined the DSO in 1974, coming to Detroit from an orchestra in Winnetka. He began as a clarinet player, but decided early on the bassoon would be a good career move.

"When I was in eighth grade, my best friend played first clarinet in the junior high band and I played second clarinet. He was a better player than I was. There were no bassoonists, so I figured if I played bassoon I could be first chair," Williams said.

"I've done very well with the thing."

He is a founder of the DSO Bassoon Quartet and has been on a number of music faculties, including those of Michigan State University, the University of Michigan and Wayne State University.

Williams can be heard on the DSO recordings with former conductor Antal Dorati and on the DSO's 1993 "Encore," recorded with conductor Neeme Järvi. He is featured on the Martin Scott Kosins 1981 compact disc "Love Letters," which was narrated by the late John Carradine.

Williams and his wife, DSO oboist and English Horn player Treva

Womble, run a small home business which provides tools and instruments for oboes and bassoon players. Williams makes his own reeds from dried grasses imported from France, starting with machine tools and then finishing the job by hand. He's produced 15 for tonight's concert, hoping "to find the one reed that works."

Masri-Fletcher, who holds a master's degree from the Juilliard School, was appointed principal harp of the DSO in 1988.

While she started out as a violinist, she fell in love with the harp when attending a concert as a high school student.

"I was very attracted to the sound of it, the glissandi, the chords. I thought, 'what is making this noise?'" she recalls.

Masri-Fletcher, unlike Williams, does not come from a musical background: "My dad plays the radio and that's about it. I'm like the fluke in the family."

Being a "fluke" has taken the native Californian throughout western and eastern Europe as a performer, including to the Spoleto Festivals in Italy and South Carolina. She is active as a solo recitalist and is a member of the Lyric Chamber Ensemble.

With Monroe, Masri-Fletcher has recently released "After A Dream..." a compact disc of familiar classical music they've arranged.

For the Mozart piece, Masri-Fletcher has composed her own cadenza, the virtuoso section for the soloist.

"Writing your own cadenzas is unusual. Most people use the cadenzas written by other people," she explained.

Unfortunately, this concerto is the only one Mozart created for the harp.

"He never wrote again for the harp. That's a sad thing for the harpist," Masri-Fletcher added.

Along with the Mozart, the program includes Wagner's "Prelude and Love-Death" from "Tristan und

Isolde," "Siegfried's Rhine Journey" from "Götterdämmerung," and the overture to "The Flying Dutchman."

Tonight's performance is at 8 p.m., followed by a Friday concert at 10:45 a.m. and a Saturday show at 8:30 p.m. Tickets for the evening concerts

are \$50, \$31, \$28 and \$15, while tickets for Friday are \$50, \$23, \$21 and \$12.

## 'Mr. Wonderful' takes a second look at first love

Matt Dillon, Annabella Sciorra, Mary-Louise Parker and William Hurt star in "Mr. Wonderful," a bittersweet romantic comedy about a divorced man learning about the mysteries of love as he searches for the perfect mate for his ex-wife.

Dillon is Gus, a Con Edison worker in New York, a young guy from the old neighborhood who married his high school sweetheart, hung with his childhood friends and thought life would take care of itself.

But his wife, Lee (Sciorra) had other ideas. She wanted to improve herself and leave the neighborhood and its claustrophobic ways behind.

Eventually, that meant saying good-bye to Gus as well and beginning a college education.

Now Gus has a new girl — and Rita (Parker), a nurse, is a sweetheart who's ready to get married and start a family. Gus, however, gets aggravated every time he thinks of Lee — and Rita worries that he thinks of Lee a bit too often.

His buddies, in an effort to bring Gus in as a partner in restoring a beloved neighborhood bowling alley, suggest finding a Mr. Wonderful for Lee — someone to marry her and take the burden of financial support from Gus' shoulders.

And it's not until he's enlisted the help of everyone from Rita to the charming, good-hearted and eligible pharmacist down the block that Gus begins to wonder what it really is that he wants from life — and from Lee.

Meanwhile, Lee, who's enjoying the guilty pleasure of a fling with her married English professor (Hurt), is suddenly adrift in memory and emotion as she perceives an array of romantic choices before her.

"Mr. Wonderful" takes a poignant second look at first love. Contrasting the gritty realities of life as an electrician with the mysterious electricity of romance, the movie reflects on

friendship, old times and new horizons.

An important non-speaking character in "Mr. Wonderful" is the City of New York, which contributes a spectacular visual setting as well as a social and emotional context for the movie.

Marianne Maloney, who produced the film, noted that the four lead actors are all New Yorkers. "I'm a New York native, as are many of the supporting actors and crew members," she noted. "We had a strong feeling that only New York could present this story as it was written — from the ethnic neighborhoods that Gus and

his buddies inhabit to the underground maze of the city's electrical systems.

"This could happen anywhere, but the New York setting made it happen in a special way here."

Gus and his crew are employees of Consolidated Edison, the labyrinthine public utility that brings light and electrical power to New York City. Their work takes them all over the urban landscape and frequently underneath it, into the metropolitan infrastructure.

Electrical power works fluently as a metaphor for that romantic link, as when Gus fixes a circuit in a Manhattan

bridge, causing the entire string of lights across its span to spring into dazzling life — magic that occurs when a single crucial connection is repaired.

Additional locations in New York include Barnard College as the setting for Lee's studies; Greenwich Village as the site of Con Edison's emergency repairs; the Brooklyn Navy Yard and the Brooklyn Historical Society.

Cinematographer Geoffrey Simpson bathes New York in a romantic glow by day and sparkling lights at night, underscoring the traditional appeal of a great city when seen through the eyes of lovers.

Lakeland's Brandy Taylor and South Lyon's Cori Sutton make their second appearance on the All-Area team. Sutton, a junior, returns next year and may be a three-time pick.

Milford's Megan Readler rounds out the squad with all-around ability and solid athletic skills.

Now let's take a closer look at this year's Hometown Newspapers' East All-Area Basketball first team:

### KRISTIN KENNY

Novi forward

Perhaps the Wildcats' greatest player of all time, Kenny came up big in her senior season. She led Novi in scoring with a 15.6 points-per-game average.

"She had big games when we needed her to have big games," coach John Hoffman said. "It was the best of her four years."

Hoffman counted on Kenny for

scoring and rebounding. While she averaged nearly eight boards per game, Kenny also delivered on the defensive end.

"She made a big improvement on defense," said Hoffman. "She played smarter."

In past years, Kenny had slumps at some point during the season. Not this time around, Hoffman said.

"She started off the way we expected and maintained it all year," he added. "For the most part, she was steady and had a strong year."

### SAMANTHA LEGER

Northville forward

The sophomore had a huge impact on the Mustangs this fall. A team that lacked a leader last year, Leger took charge with her slashing, Charles Barkley-like bull-rushes to the basket.

Northville nearly doubled its win total from a year ago with Leger in the lineup. The sophomore led the way by leading the Mustangs in nearly every category: scoring, rebounding and assists, to name a few.

Her play didn't go unnoticed. Leger was named to the Western Lakes Activities Association Western Division first team.

### MEGAN READLER

Milford forward

Readler has been a mainstay of the Milford program for four years — all of which she spent as a varsity player.

Her senior year was no disappointment, as she led the team in both scoring, with 8.4 points per game, and rebounding, with an average of 5.9 boards. Her real ability came out

in her versatility. She played everything from the post to the point during the course of the season.

"She did a lot of ball handling," Palmer said. "She played a lot of two-guard for us. She's one of the best passing forwards I've ever had; she's a very good interior passer."

Milford's team wasn't blessed with any superstars this year. Instead, the Redskins garnered a winning season by utilizing several quality players — and Readler was definitely that.

"We had to use her versatility," Palmer said. "She had a good career. A good senior year topped it off for her."

### CORI SUTTON

South Lyon center

This is the 5-foot-11 junior's second trip to the All-Area lineup, after making the squad as a sophomore.

Her game matured this year as Sutton led the team in points with 11 a game, rebounds with six a game and blocked shots with 33.

"She was our go-to girl," said Lions coach Ron Shanks. "She was the one we based our offense around. Teams tried to stop that and she had a lot of double-teaming working against her."

Sutton also led the Lions with 42 percent field-goal shooting. She shot 62 percent from the free-throw line.

"She improved her shot selection and her percentage this year, but her biggest improvement was on defense," Shanks said. "She blocked shots and stayed out of foul trouble. She was able to be more aggressive on defense."

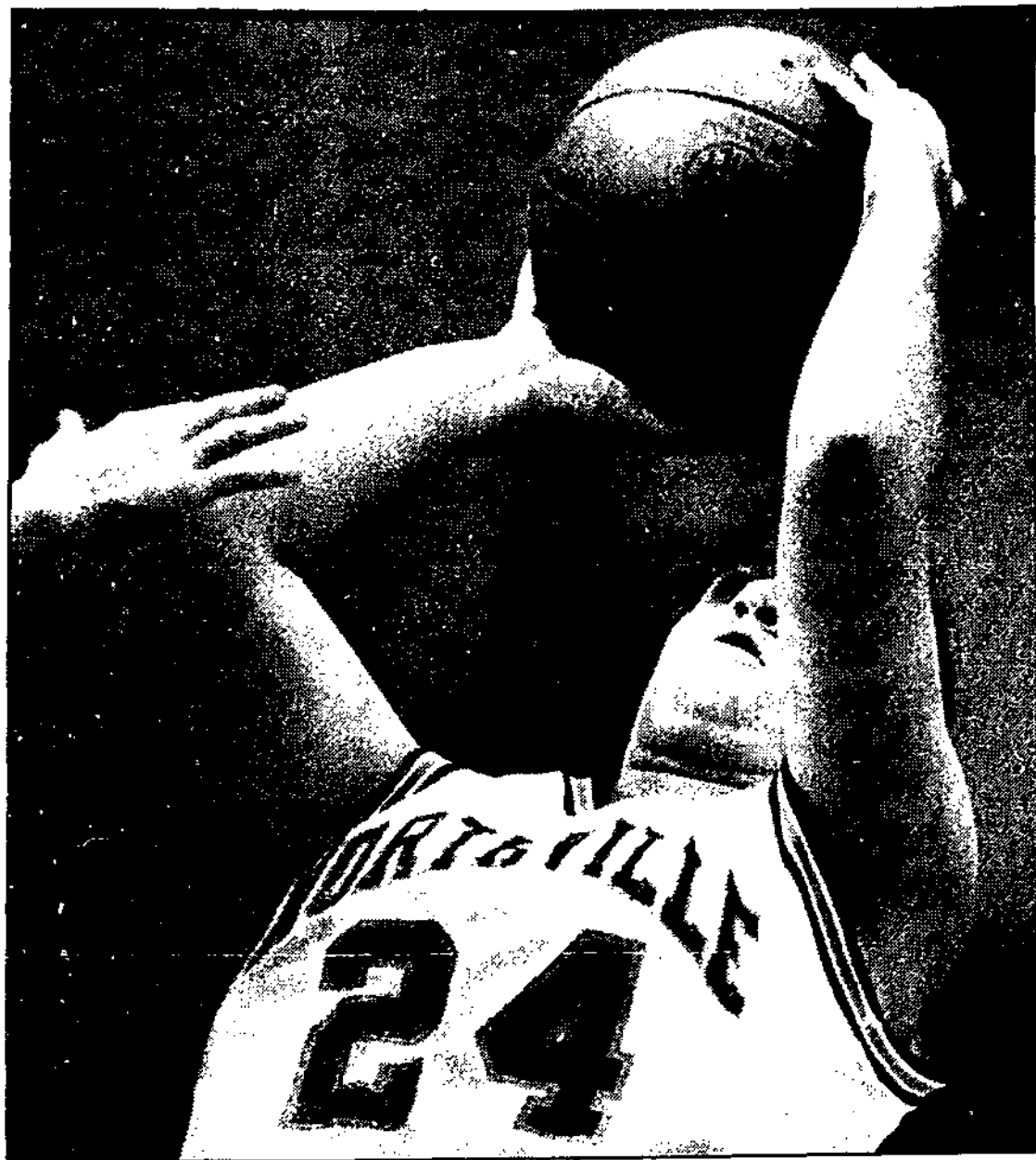

## NHS to field cheer team

It just doesn't get any respect. But things are changing in the high school sports scene. While many students and fans refuse to recognize cheerleading as a sport, the one voice that really matters already does.

For the first time in its history, the Michigan High School Athletic Association is recognizing competitive cheerleading this winter.

While cheerleaders can still be found kicking their feet and pumping their arms along the sidelines at basketball games, their roles as "cheer leaders" are only a part of their duties.

Many prep cheerleading squads have long been involved in head-to-head competitions. With the MHSAA now overseeing the sport, however, competitive cheerleading will be more and more in the limelight — just like football, basketball, volleyball, softball, etc.

## Huzjak settles into starting QB position

Heading into the 1993 season, Ryan Huzjak was listed third on Toledo University's depth chart at quarterback.

But anybody who watched him slice through enemy defenses for Northville High from 1989-91 knew that wouldn't last long. So when Huzjak took the reins as Toledo's starting signal caller midway through his first campaign it came as little surprise to some.

"Ryan is a competitor," said Mustang coach Darrel Schumacher, who guided Huzjak during his Northville career. "When he chose to play college football he knew to be the number one quarterback he'd have to put the time into it to do it."

And he has. Huzjak, who set 11 passing records at Northville, was red-shirted his first year at Toledo. A common practice in college football, "red shirt" allows players to sit out a season (even while attending classes) and retain four years of eligibility. Time is spent learning the nuances of big-time football and lifting weights.

Coming into camp late this summer, Toledo hadn't settled on a quarterback. Rocket coach Gary Pinkel went with Tim Kubiak, a sophomore out of Mt. Clemens, to start the season.

Kubiak piled up impressive sta-

istics with eight touchdowns and only four interceptions. But on the heels of a three-game losing streak, Pinkel went to the more mobile Huzjak.

"I have high expectations of myself," the Northville High graduate said. "My goal was to come in and play."

After taking the starting job, Huzjak guided Mid-American Conference Toledo to two wins in its last five games. While his passing numbers were decent for a first year QB (68 of 132 for 806 yards), he gave the Rockets an extra dimension by running for nearly 400 yards.

"He's a very talented guy," said Pinkel. "If you look at all the quarterbacks in the NFL that make it to the final four, they can get out of trouble. He's got the ability to do that."

Huzjak showed his running and throwing abilities in Toledo's season-ending 14-0 win over Eastern Michigan University on Nov. 19.

On a cold and windy Ohio night, he was hot out of the gate. After missing on his first attempt, Huzjak connected on a 24-yard pass to move deep into Eastern territory. Four plays later he threw his fifth touchdown strike of the year, a 24-yard pass in which he sprinted out of the pocket and found a wide open receiver in the right corner of the end zone.

# Mustangs will field active cheer team

Northville High will join the ranks of schools participating in competitive cheerleading this winter.

According to Northville Athletic Director Dennis Colligan, the Mustangs will take part in four competitions in cities like St. Johns, Waterford and Frankenmuth. He said the program will be on an experimental basis this season with an eye on establishing it as a permanent sport at the high school.

"I think it's a great idea," said Colligan. "We're going to see if we want to move to going full fledged."

Other schools are moving ahead as well.

South Lyon, Brighton and Fowlerville are sporting MHSAA competitive varsity cheer teams this winter. In past years, those schools — along with Lakeland, Milford, Howell, Hartland and Pinckney — have competed at league tournaments or other state competitions such as those sponsored by the Michigan Cheerleading Coaches Association (MCCA).

The MHSAA competitions will feature teams in three different routines: compulsory, jumping and creative. A panel of judges will award points to the teams based on their skills. The judging format takes into account a number of criteria and is very similar to the scoring of gymnastics and figure skating.

Statewide, 190 of the MHSAA's 694 member schools are participating in the MHSAA's first-year sport. Many other non-participants are taking a wait-and-see approach before deciding to enter teams next year.

"Several schools want to see what happens the first year," said Suzanne Martin, assistant director of the

MHSAA. "Many schools are concerned about their financial status as it is. They want to be sure there's enough interest before they add another sports program."

Many school systems are looking at more than just dollars and cents. Adding competitive cheer adds to a growing cheerleading picture that can include pom-pom squads, support cheer and performance cheer.

"So many different questions have come up," said Jim Horan, Huron Valley Athletic Director. "Would the coach of support cheer also coach competitive cheer? Most schools are going to leave that up to the present cheerleading coach."

"If you do have two coaches, would you have the support cheer squad work basketball games and then hold tryouts for competitive cheer with another coach? It would be just like having two different sports."

Northville won't have separate squads in its first season, Colligan said. He said the school's sideline cheerleaders will be participating in state competitions this winter. It's possible cheerleading and competitive cheer could be separated down the road, Colligan added.

While 190 out of 694 MHSAA schools (27 percent) may not sound like much, it is a large number for an initial season.

"One-hundred and ninety is an excellent number for the first year," Martin said. "That's already more schools than sponsor gymnastics, hockey, boys and girls skiing, girls soccer and girls golf."

More schools can join the MHSAA competitive cheer ranks as the season progresses.

"I think we could see another 10 to 20 schools added over the next couple

ple of months," Martin said. "We were expecting 200-250 schools for this season."

MHSAA member teams must participate in a minimum of four competitions in order to be eligible for the post-season regional and state tournaments.

Seventh-year Fowlerville coach Peggy Lintemuth, the dean of cheerleading coaches in Livingston County, said she has mixed feelings about the new MHSAA competitions.

"I like it and I don't," she said. "The thing I'm worried about is our girls, along with the girls from other schools, are going to end up missing some Friday-night basketball games because of (cheerleading) competi-

tions on Saturday," she said. "I still think cheerleading is first and foremost about being at games and cheering on your team."

Those concerns don't apply to some schools, such as South Lyon. "We've always done it that way," said SLHS cheerleading coach Linda Deering. "We've always been in at least two to three competitions during the winter season."

"We've never been in as many competitions as we will have to be in this year (four are required). It will take a couple more competitions, but we've always done it in the past."

The new MHSAA rules could pose a problem for the annual Kensington Valley Conference cheer competition. Currently only Brighton and South

Lyon are fielding competitive cheer teams. The KVC meet does not currently follow MHSAA guidelines; unless the KVC changes its format, those two schools will have to have four Saturday meets on top of the KVC meet, which is also held on a Saturday.

"It has to conform to MHSAA cheerleading guidelines to count as an official event," said Horan, the Huron Valley athletic director. "It hasn't been that way in the past and the school would have to conform to that. The league's cheer coaches are very concerned about this."

A decade ago cheerleaders were expected primarily to look good and to get football and basketball fans

fired up with basic cheers and moves. Nowadays, hours and hours of hard work and practice go into the athletes' training and routines so they can score highly at invitational meets.

"The girls are very excited," Deering said. "To me it's great because we'll finally be recognized. We've always been recognized as a sport by the school, but hopefully this will open up the eyes of everybody who doesn't view us as athletes. This will help show that it takes quite a bit of work to get it together."

The MHSAA competitive cheer districts will be held Feb. 12; the regionals are Feb. 19 and the state championships are Feb. 26.

"I love it," Huzjak said. "It's what I've wanted to do my whole life — play college football. It's going great."

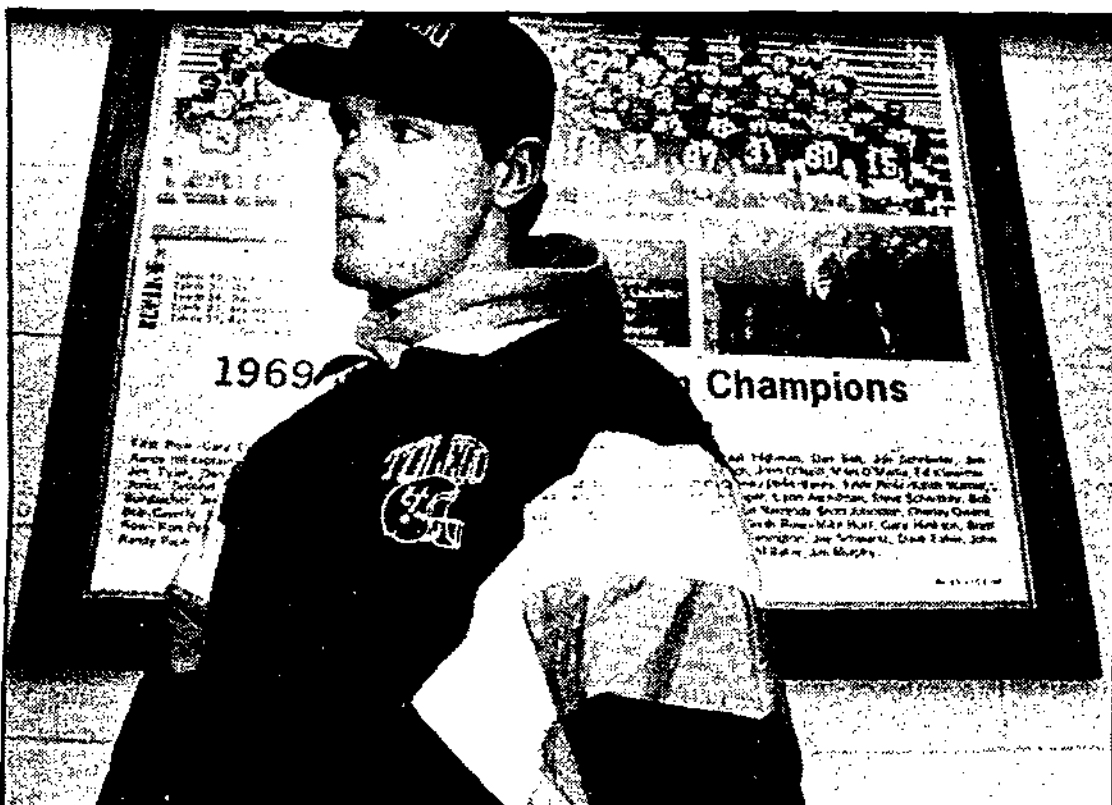

Pietila was also a clutch free-throw shooter in crunch time. Seventeen of South Lyon's 21 games were decided by eight points or less, and seven of those games were in overtime. Much of Pietila's .695 free-throw percentage came during game-deciding situations.

## Rabies incidents rare in United States

Is your family at risks for rabies? The answer to this disturbing question is simple. Everyone bitten by an animal is at risk for rabies. Fortunately, rabies is preventable if the vaccine is given promptly.

Rabies is a viral disease that originates in animals and can be spread to humans through animal bites or contact with the blood or saliva of infected animals. When a person is bitten by an animal with rabies, the first symptoms appear four to eight weeks after exposure. The infection usually begins with fever, fatigue, increased agitation, increased salivation, confusion, paralysis and difficulty swallowing. Excessive salivation and difficulty swallowing leads to the traditional "foaming at the mouth." Eventually the person lapses into a coma and dies.

This is a grim picture, but it is entirely preventable with the vaccine if the appropriate actions are taken. Any animal bite should be reported to the local

health department or local physician. Not every person bitten by an animal needs to be vaccinated. In fact, more than one million people are bitten each year and only a small fraction of them are vaccinated.

The vaccine costs about \$2,000 and can have some uncomfortable side effects. For these reasons, it is important that only those at risk be vaccinated. The most important thing to determine is whether or not the animal is infected with rabies.

If the animal can be caught, it should be quarantined and watched for 10 days. If it is not fine after 10 days, or the animal can't be caught, vaccination should proceed immediately. Rodents and rabbits (excluding woodchucks) very rarely acquire rabies. Bites from these animals do not require vaccinations unless the rodent or rabbit was acting aggressive.

Rabies is well established in wild animal populations in almost every state. The most common animals infected are raccoons, skunks, foxes, wolves, bats, cats and dogs. Sick animals usually act aggressive and bizarre. World-wide, the number of infected persons range around 50,000 a year.

In third world countries, dogs are the most common animal to infect humans.

In the United States, the number of rabies cases is about five a year, and most of them are spread by bats. The incidence is very low in the United States because of dog vaccination policies and appropriate vaccinations for those at high risk.

Pre-exposure vaccination is recommended only for veterinarians, zoo workers and cave explorers. Without question, the best way to prevent rabies is to decrease the number of people bitten by and handling animals. Children must be instructed never to approach, pet or feed any strange animal. They must be taught never to handle dead animals.

In the event of exposure to a rabid animal, it is a comfort to know that an effective vaccination treatment exists. The local health department or physician must be notified of any exposure so that a decision regarding vaccination can be made.

### A new type of reverse mortgage

A new type of reverse mortgage has been introduced. And it could give this senior-targeted concept a big boost in consumer acceptance and popularity.

A reverse mortgage is a special type of loan available to senior homeowners over the age of 62. It allows the senior to tap the equity acquired in his or her home to generate a monthly income. The homeowner receives a check every month from the mortgage company, reversing the direction of conventional mortgage payments.

Up to this point, most reverse mortgage plans continued the stream of payments to the homeowner as long as the senior individual or couple owned and resided in the home securing the loan. If they sold the house or moved to another residence, the loaned amount would immediately be due and payable.

The basic plan, offered since the early 1980s, has stimulated a lot

of interest among senior homeowners. Reverse mortgages are the subject of most inquiries received by the American Association of Retired Persons. There were more than 18,000 inquiries about this product during the past year, according to Bronwyn Belling of the AARP.

The new reverse mortgage plan does not limit the payments to the period of time the senior owns and resides in the home. It can continue for the rest of the senior's life, no matter where he or she (or the couple) lives.

The plan is offered by Transamerica HomeFirst, a subsidiary of Transamerica Corp., one of the nation's largest life insurance carriers. The plan includes an annuity provided by Metropolitan Life Insurance Co. or Transamerica Occidental Life Insurance Co., another subsidiary of Transamerica Corp.

Similar reverse mortgage plans will undoubtedly be offered by

### Plenty of room to spread out in the Manchester 2

Even a large family won't feel cramped in the Manchester 2. Bright and spacious, this five-bedroom, two-story home provides plenty of room to spread out.

Family living areas, the master suite and an office are downstairs. Four more bedrooms and the utility room are on the upper level.

hearthed fireplace provide a cheerful focal point on dark winter days.

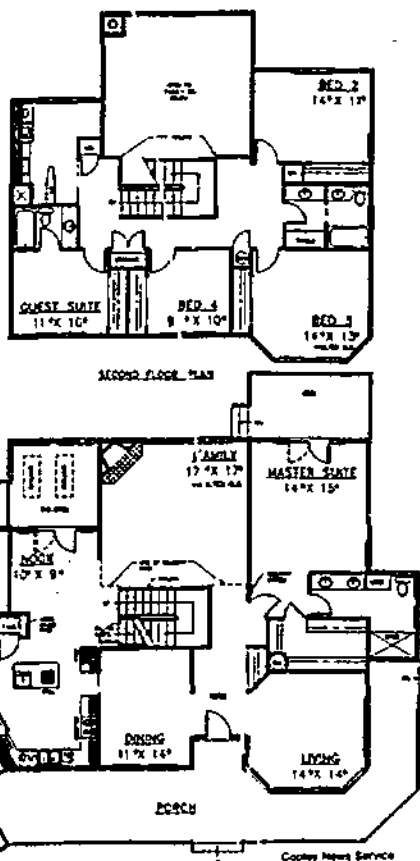
The dining room and living room face the street. Although rich in windows — especially the living room — the light is softened by the covered porch.

## KNOW THY NEIGHBOR

Getting to know your neighbors isn't just a common courtesy. It makes good safety sense, according to area law enforcement officials.

Lt. Ivan Deering of the Livingston County Sheriff's Department said the easiest way to protect yourself and home from thieves is to keep in touch with your neighbors.

"First and foremost, people have to talk with their neighbors," he said. "You've got to let them know what your habits are."

If a neighbor notices a strange car in the area or strangers at a home at a time when people are not normally at home, they should call the police, Deering said. Suspicious-looking people driving through a neighborhood slowly could be looking for an easy target.

A common misconception is that break-ins take place at night, Deering said. Actually, the majority take place in the hours just after people leave for work or in the early afternoon. A moving van or repair vehicle could actually be a front for a burglar.

When it comes to the burglar-proofing the home, adequate locks on doors and windows are a good start, but they're not the only way to keep out criminals, Deering said.

"I don't care what kind of locks you put on your door," he said. "If these people want to get in, they're going to get in."

Deering said with the price of home alarms coming down, he also suggests that homeowners invest in a good system. He said \$1,000-\$1,200 is reasonable for a system when you think of all the valuables found in a home. An audible alarm will often deter a criminal or at least keep the criminal from ransacking a home, he said.

Vincent Miceli, owner of Allstar Alarm Co. in Howell, said he has sold systems for as little as \$300-\$400 for a

Here are a few of the things homeowners can do to protect their home from burglars:

**UPDATE locks.** This is a good idea especially when you change houses or apartments.

**DON'T leave an extra key.** USE outside lighting.

**DON'T leave tools, furniture and playthings in the yard overnight.**

**LEAVE at least one light on in the house when leaving for an evening.**

**TALK to your neighbors.** Let them know if you plan to be gone for extended periods of time.

basic package including wiring for a couple of doors and a motion detector.

An average system for three or four doors, 10-12 windows, a motion detector and glass protection might cost about \$1,200, he said. Prices depend on the options a person wants to include.

Consumers should know that companies offering extremely low prices on systems can do so because often those systems are leased to the homeowner. With a leased system, the homeowner is often required to pay a monthly fee for the system in addition to the installation cost.

Jewelry, cash, VCRs, TVs and guns are the items most easily stolen, Deering said. It's surprising how many people do not have serial numbers or any identifying information about valuable items, he added.

Police suggest taking photographs of furniture and paintings or any other item that might be hard to identify through a verbal description.

Possessions should be marked with a driver's license number or any other easily traceable identification number.

"We can't enter them as stolen if we don't have the serial numbers," Deering said. "People who commit breaking and enterings don't usually do just one. They'll have several."

When the criminals are eventually caught it makes it easier to trace the stolen property if the serial numbers are known.

If safes are used it is best to bolt them to a concrete floor. A safe just sitting in a closet may be carried off.

"These criminals don't want to work for a living, that's why they're stealing from you," he said. "That's why you

## Select right plants to avoid pests

## GARDENING

You can reduce garden and landscape maintenance, including the amount of pesticides you need, by making wise choices of plant materials. Start by selecting plants that are suited to your area, including native plants.

To maintain healthy plants with few pest problems, look for insect and disease-resistant varieties.

At purchase time:

- Select plants that are sturdy and have well-developed root systems.

- Buy plants from a reputable grower who can assure you that they are disease- and insect-free, or better still, grow your own from seed.

- Avoid accepting plants from friends if there is any chance they have insects or disease.

Native or naturalized plants usually are more tolerant of local environmental conditions and pests, ensuring better performance with less care.

Beware, though, some native trees can also be problem trees, having either messy fruit (mulberry), troublesome root systems (willows) or high susceptibility to pests (black locust).

Disease-resistant varieties are plants that have been developed to resist a specific

disease. A resistant variety is not resistant to all disease but only to those for which it has been developed.

Disease resistance does not mean that the plant will not get the disease, but the disease will at least be less severe than for susceptible varieties.

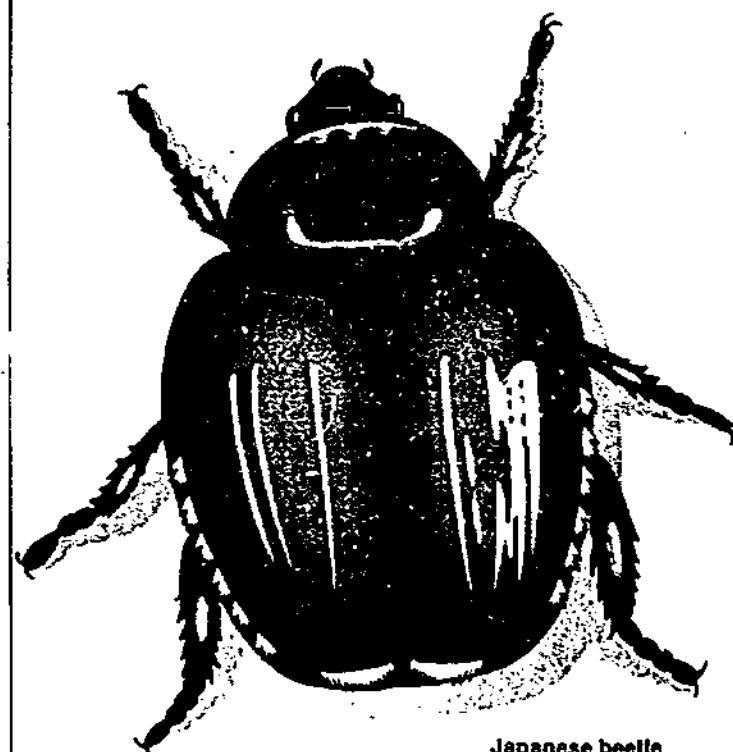
Fruit trees, including those grown for flowers, such as Kwanzan cherry, are often subject to disease and Japanese beetle infestation. Management of fruit trees with pesticides requires a genuine commitment of time and knowledge.

Using disease-resistant varieties of vegetables not only makes gardening easier, but also reduces the expense and potential for pollution with pesticides. Although many nontoxic materials are used to control vegetable disease, it is best to avoid all pesticide use if possible by selecting disease-resistant varieties. Seed catalogs indicate which varieties are resistant to various diseases.

Insect-resistant plants are bred to resist or repel insects by physical or biochemical means. An insect-resistant plant can physically deter insects from extracting plant

- Select sturdy plants with well-developed root systems.
- Purchase disease-free, insect-free plants from reputable sources.
- Avoid free plants if there is any chance they may be diseased.
- Native plants are more tolerant of local weather conditions and pests than other varieties.
- Fruit trees, including those grown for flowers, are often subject to infestations of Japanese beetles.

# These chimney problems need professional help

**Q.** What measures would you suggest to stop bricks from flaking? My brick chimney keeps flaking above the roof line, and small chunks of brick fall off. I have replaced the missing pieces and chunks of brick with various materials such as tibia bricks, cement, plastic compounds, etc. Each time repairs were made, I further protected the brick by spraying or brushing with a water-sealing compound such as Thompson's.

**A.** So far, nothing I have done has really been successful in stopping the flaking or chipping. Do you have any sugges-

tions on how to remedy this situation?—E.F.

**A.** Moisture is the culprit. In more severe climates, moisture penetrates the brick and is exposed to freeze/thaw cycles, which cause deterioration of the brick.

Chimney tops face the worst weathering of all. Hot exhaust gases from the furnace heat it and subject the bricks and mortar to more freeze/thaw cycles than other brick structures.

A common problem is a poor cap design on the top of a chimney. The cap, or "crown," of a chimney is often constructed by spreading a tapered bed of mortar over the top bricks rather than casting it in concrete or using precast concrete or

stone. Over the years these mortar caps crack and allow water to penetrate the brickwork below. When this deterioration has progressed to the point that bricks are flaking and literally falling out, it is usually too late for mortar repair and brick replacement.

The cap on your chimney probably needs to be rebuilt with a stone or concrete cap, which can keep moisture out. Any severely damaged bricks in the chimney structure should be replaced. This is an extensive job and best left to a profes-

sional.

**Q.** Our home has bare wood floors, including a wood staircase. Do you know of anyway to make the stairs non-slip? The floors have area rugs and are not too slippery, but I am concerned about the stairs.

**A.** We have three young children, and I need a finish that is both durable and nonskid. I would like to maintain the natural wood finish.—H.G.

**A.** You can use a varnish treatment similar to texturing paint for a nonskid surface.

Remove any wax from the finished wood and apply two or three coats of a durable

urethane varnish. Use a satin finish rather than the high-gloss finish. Allow each coat to dry for 24 hours before applying the next coat. Be sure to sand with extra-fine paper between coats.

For the final coat, mix clear silica into the finish before you apply it. Silica is available at most hardware stores and home centers. This should help give the surface enough texture to alleviate much of the slipperiness.

# A new type of reverse mortgage; Coldwell Banker must try harder

other major companies in future months and years.

The new Transamerica plan is now available in California, Pennsylvania and New Jersey. It will probably be offered in other markets across the country by the end of the year, according to Linda Hubbard, vice president of Transamerica HomeFirst.

"Up until now, consumers have been looking at reverse mortgages and expressing a lot of concerns about it," said Ken Scholen, director of the National Center on Home Equity Conversion. "Now, reverse mortgages have received a stamp of approval from the kind of com-

panies that don't do this sort of thing lightly, especially when their name is on it and their money is behind it."

The new plan works this way: For a fixed number of years, the senior (borrower) receives monthly loan advances from a reverse mortgage on his or her home. The time covered by these payments is determined by the borrower's age and life expectancy.

When those payments stop on a pre-determined date, the borrower's monthly income continues, paid from the annuity purchased in the borrower's name at the time the reverse mortgage is closed.

All borrowers must accept monthly payments of at least

\$150, but they may choose to take some of their equity in either a line-of-credit reserve account or in a lump sum. It's a very flexible plan with many options.

The borrower is charged interest on all loan advances and will owe the lending company at least 50 percent of the home's future appreciation (increased value). However, the total amount owed can never exceed the future value of the home.

The plan offered by Transamerica HomeFirst is designed for persons aged 65 or older who own a home valued at \$100,000 or more, a company spokesman said.

An example cited by the company is a 75-year-old widow living in

a home worth \$257,000. She would be able to take a lump sum payment of \$8,500 at 10.5 percent fixed interest rate, receive monthly payments of \$650 at a 10.5 percent rate, and enjoy a \$7,500 line of credit at a 12.5 percent fixed rate.

One reason Transamerica and other firms are now sparking up to this new reverse mortgage concept is that it's salable to the secondary market—organizations that purchase existing mortgage loans from primary lenders. This has not always been the case with these specialized mortgages, due to investor's lack of understanding of the product.

Before rushing out to sign up for

one of these reverse mortgages, seniors should carefully study all aspects of the currently available plans.

For example, the annuity payments that are part of the newly offered plan are viewed as income by both the Internal Revenue Service and public benefits programs like Supplemental Security Income and Medicaid. This means that not only will borrowers pay taxes on their annuity income, but this income could reduce any benefits they receive from SSI or Medicaid.

In some cases, the annuity income could actually make a homeowner ineligible to receive these public benefits, it was noted by Scholen.

"The annuity component also makes the reverse annuity mortgage riskier than the traditional reverse mortgage," Scholen cautioned. "If the insurance company offering the annuity has a financial failure, the borrower cannot be sure he or she will ever see another monthly check."

The best way to minimize risk is to investigate thoroughly the financial strength of the insurance company offering the annuity."

juices, for example, by the composition of its leaf hairs.

Another instance of physical deterrence would be a stem structure that is incompatible with a particular insect's breeding habits (egg laying).

A plant possessing biochemical insect-resistant traits will contain plant sap or toxins that are unappealing to the insect, possibly causing the insect to become sick.

The plant sap could also be nutritionally incomplete for the insect, leaving the insect unable to complete its life cycle.

## CRITTER CONTROL

Two more repellants to repel deer: Deer Away, made from putrescent egg solids (yuck) and Hot Sauce, made from hot peppers, both very effective according to tests.

Of course, some gardeners report success with homemade concoctions such as eggs blended in water with chili peppers

and shaved laundry soap, herbs and garlic. Both are great Bambi-busting techniques.

**Q.** What types of shrubs and trees will attract a variety of birds to my back yard?

**A.** Birds are attracted to plants that provide food and cover. Dense vines, shrubs and trees provide a place to breed, refuge from predators, a nesting space, a place to stay warm or cool and to dry off. For example, an unmowed meadow is the perfect spot for ground-nesting birds and gives them a good hunting ground for insects.

To provide proper cover, plant shrubs more densely than normally, such as in clumps behind flower and vegetable beds or as thick hedges near an open meadow.

Fill in between trees with shade-tolerant ground covers and shrubs to create a continuous environment of vegetation.

Birds and other wildlife feel more comfortable with naturally shaped and even

leggy plants to heavily pruned shrubs or trees. Keep in mind over-pruned shrubs have fewer seeds, buds and berries for birds to eat.

And don't use pesticides (they're poison) on plantings meant to attract birds. It not only kills them but eliminates insects birds count on for food.

Select plants that produce seeds or fruit at different times of the year. If you have a dead tree, keep it. Many types of birds nest in the cavities of dead trees and fence posts.

The following shrubs, trees and vines are attractive as food sources and cover for many birds:

- Trees: Flowering dogwood, hawthorne, magnolia, mulberry, crab apple, plum and cherry.

- Shrubs: Gooseberry, blueberry, bayberry, elderberry, crab apple, American holly, pyracantha and firethorn.

- Vines: Honeysuckle, grape and Virginia creeper.

Outside the home, use lights triggered by motion to keep potential burglars off your property, Deering said.

"Someone trying to break into your home doesn't know that you're not in

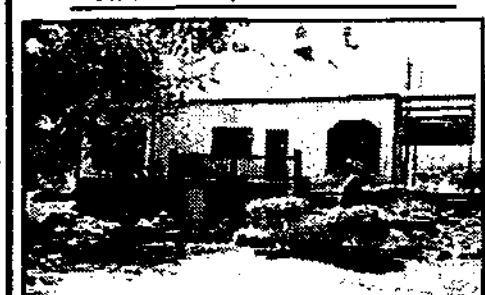

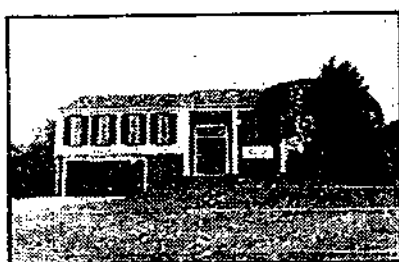

# Facelift helps credit union serve clients

After several months of renovation work, Research Federal Credit Union's Milford branch office has a brand new look and will be better able to serve its customers.

Jodi Huss, marketing coordinator for the Milford office, said a leaky basement was only one of the problems that needed to be addressed by the work on the building built in 1985.

"Architecturally, there were some problems with the original building," Huss said.

Geri Walko, manager of the Milford office, said that the building "was not structurally sound."

Daniels and Zernack Associates Inc. of Ann Arbor designed and completed the entire renovation project. In addition to addressing the original inadequacies of the facility, the renovation expanded usable space in the 7,400-square-foot building by an additional 3,500 square feet.

Huss said another need met by the renovation process was better utilization of existing space to improve services for Research Federal's growing membership.

"Three years ago, we were four employees here," Walko said. "We are now 15 in number. You can see how we're growing to offer personal financial services."

The membership includes many General Motors employees and family members, members of Huron Valley and South Lyon Area Chamber of Commerce (HVCC) and their families, and employees of HVCC members.

During the renovation, "we tried to let members know about alternative services" so that they could avoid the mess and the construction dust, Huss said, adding that many members came in to check the progress of

the renovation anyway.

"The hardest part was trying to keep warm and function with construction noise and dust," she said.

Employees worked throughout the construction process which began Dec. 15 and concluded near the end of August. In order to deal with the construction dust, employees were allowed to wear casual dress. In July, construction settled down enough for employees to resume professional dress.

"We were only closed for 10 minutes from the normal hours to close the old entrance and open the new one," Walko said.

The grand opening took place Oct. 18 to 22 during the celebration of National Credit Union Week. Research Federal Credit Union celebrated 57 years of service and 19 years of service for the Milford branch office.

The renovation work included lowering the building's cathedral ceiling, replacing all flooring and carpeting, redesigning the existing space to allow for construction of a private member services area, adding a sprinkler system which meets new construction code requirements, and changing the dark mauve walls, ceilings, and floors to lighter and brighter colors.

"Decorating has taken a giant leap

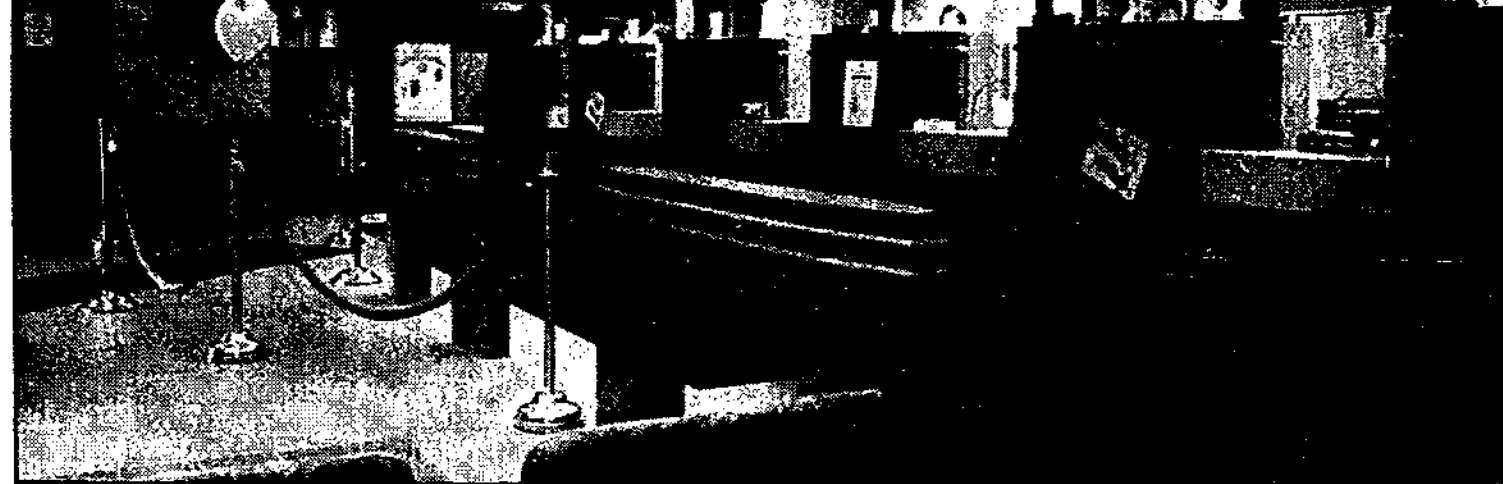

up," Walko said.

Huss explained that one of the primary advantages to members is that the new member service area, located to the right of the main entrance, allows for greater client privacy when discussing confidential matters such as loans and investments.

In addition, Walko said, the tellers were off to one side of the lobby rather

than their present location directly across from the building entrance.

The renovation is definitely more customer-friendly, Huss said.

The customer drive-through area was moved from the building's south side to the west side and has two lanes instead of one.

Other relocations include the moving of the night depository next to the new drive-through area, more

safety deposit boxes, and ATM relocation to the south side of the building.

An additional service area which resulted from the renovation is the full-service mortgage department which is located in an unused portion of the basement.

"The best aspect of the renovation

is that (the credit union) is member-friendly," Huss said.

Walko said that Diana Dulkiewicz, vice president of facilities for Research Federal, initiated and directed the renovation efforts. Walko added that the credit union facility is fully approved to meet Americans With Disabilities Act requirements "from the bathroom to the basement."
