

Search for manager nears interview stage

Closer and closer every time you turn around.

That's one way to describe Northville Township's continuing effort to find a new manager. After months of work and waiting, the board of trustees may soon be ready to conduct public interviews of finalists for the full-time township chief executive's position.

The township has been without a manager since Bill Richards left in February,

with Supervisor Karen Baja stepping in to fill the gap. Earlier this summer, the board gave its approval to hiring an executive consultant to assist them in selecting a new manager. The end of the 120-day time line the board set in May is coming later this month; officials hope to have the matter decided within that time frame.

A delay may be inevitable, however, because consultant Jerry Habelman, brought on board to run the head hunt, had a mild stroke recently. Trustee Mark

Abbo told the board.

He did recover, but the hunt was slowed somewhat because of the situation. Abbo said. Habelman is back on track now, completing telephone interviews with 14 candidates on his short list last week. He has received more than 60 applications for the position, which he advertised in trade magazines and Detroit newspapers this summer.

Habelman will then whittle down that group to a list of the top six or so candi-

dates to interview in the next week or two. From that group he will recommend two or three finalists for the public interviews. Habelman will be paid up to \$10,000 for his efforts.

Members of the board have cited a variety of qualities they'd like to see in the person who will occupy Township Hall's corner office. Officials are looking for:

- A candidate with at least a bachelor's degree, preferably someone with a mas-

ter's degree in public administration or business.

- Someone who is "person-friendly."
- Someone with a minimum of five years in public administration.

Depending on his or her qualifications, the selected candidate will receive from \$48,000 to \$55,000 a year along with negotiable relocation expenses and a benefits package. The board has decided the new manager will not be required to move to the township.

Review to decide Salem sewer sale

Firm to study line flow

Just how much sewer capacity can Northville Township afford to sell to Salem Township?

A Bloomfield Hills engineering firm is going to find out. Its report could lead the township's board of trustees to approve or deny Salem Township's request to buy some sewer line flow capacity.

The board gave a tentative OK to the sale in late June. Trustees hope to help Salem Township alleviate a sewage disposal problem while making a little money for the township. That money would go to pay off the township's multi-million-dollar Western Townships Utilities Authority (WTUA) construction debt.

The June approval was contingent on the trustees also deciding that Northville Township could spare Salem a slice of its sewer flow. At their Aug. 25 meeting, trustees voted 7-0 to hire the engineering firm of Hubble, Roth & Clark to see if the township could indeed do that.

The Bloomfield Hills company will conduct a study of the township's total sanitary sewer flow capacity and is expected to issue its report within the next five weeks. The board is then expected to take up Salem Township's request again.

Eight Mile paving enters final months

Northville motorists who are getting a little antsy with construction on Eight Mile Road need not fret for much longer.

Construction on the portion of road between Novi and Meadowbrook roads, which has been reduced to a two-lane highway since March is right on schedule, said Ed Siemert, director of engineering for Wayne County.

Siemert said that most of the pavement work, which will expand the road to five-lanes, will most likely be finished by the middle of October. The entire project is slated to be finished by Nov. 1.

Once the pavement work is completed, Siemert said, construction workers will repave driveways, put traffic signs in place and stripe the road by the beginning of Novem-

ber.

Construction on the current portion of Eight Mile Road began March 16 and is costing \$2.5 million.

In addition to expanding the road to five lanes, the project includes reconstructing the bridge over the railroad tracks near Novi Road and realigning the intersection of Griswold and Eight Mile to a 90-degree angle and erecting a traffic signal there.

The current Eight Mile construction is the third phase in an ongoing project to repair the road.

Next year Wayne County will start searching for bidders to begin a \$300,000 resurfacing job of Eight Mile Road extending west from Novi Road to Center Street for sometime in 1996. Siemert expects that project to last a couple of months.

City ordinance would make tipsy drivers pay

In the future, Northville residents who drink, drive and cause an accident may be paying for more than just a drunken driving ticket.

Northville City Council members Tuesday discussed the possibility of enacting an ordinance that would force impaired drivers to foot the bill for the city to dispatch an emergency response team to

the scene of an accident or for arresting an impaired driver.

The rationale of the law hinges on the idea that motorists who drive under the influence of alcohol or drugs are more prone to cause accidents and as a result place a greater financial burden on the city.

Land deal could end lawsuit against Northville township

The chance to end a long-running lawsuit against Northville Township may be at hand.

The Angelo Iafate Co., a construction business headquartered in Oakland County, has closed a deal with Holloway Sand & Gravel to buy 175 acres of land Holloway owns at the southwest corner of

Six Mile and Ridge roads in Northville Township.

Iafate lawyer Allen Greene said the company is hoping to begin talks with Northville Township officials on ending a lawsuit Holloway filed against the township three years ago concerning the property.

"We've discussed discussing it with the township and now we're waiting to hear back from them.

We're making ourselves open and accessible to finding a solution," Greene said.

No timetable for the talks has been set, Greene said.

Iafate wants to buy the land and Holloway's non-operating asphalt plant, aiming to reopen it and begin mining sand on the site

More members, new duds kick off band's new season

When Northville High School football players took to the field last Friday night in the first game of the year, the occasion not only marked the beginning of Northville's football campaign but also the school's high-stepping marching band season.

The 1994-95 high school marching band students have been practicing half-time show tunes and marching patterns since the beginning of August, but as they take the field this year they have a new, bigger and better look.

Band members are sporting new uniforms this year, and more of them.

Enthusiasm for the marching band has blossomed with about 40 more musicians than last year, said Northville Music Boosters representative Barbara Medeiros.

The school purchased about 140 uniforms for band members to suit-up in at about \$250 a piece. The uniforms were a much needed purchase, Medeiros said, as last year's outfits were 10 years old and they would have had to be custom made to accommodate the some 40 more musicians.

Students in the music program helped raise about \$9,000 for the uniforms last year with a pop can and bottle drive and a car wash.

"There was a lot of hard work

that went into raising that money," Medeiros said.

The music program will hold its successful fund-raisers again this year to help purchase sheet music, specialty instruments and bring in speakers to talk about careers in music and to perform.

Music students will take to the streets for this year's pop can and bottle drive Oct. 8. Students will be going from door to door asking households if they would like to contribute empty cans and bottles to the program. Families who would like to help can also place a bag with cans on the curb side on Oct. 8 with a note indicating the bags are for the music students.

On Oct. 22 music students will be holding a free car wash in the high school parking lot. Students will receive pledges from local businesses and residents for the number of cars they wash.

In addition, students will be selling 1995 Michigan trivia desk calendars for \$10 this year.

In addition to an exciting upcoming year for the marching band, jazz ensemble students got the chance to perform in the Montreux Jazz Festival in Detroit last weekend, the largest free jazz festival in the country.

"They get so much out of it," Medeiros said. "It is a wonderful opportunity for them to be exposed to legendary jazz musicians."

The boys poured out the alcohol while the high school principals called the boys' parents to pick them up.

A preliminary hearing has been set for Sept. 30 at 35th District Court in Plymouth.

Kelley draws political heat accusing retailers of overcharging customers

Attorney General Frank Kelley's election-year habit of beating up on business is turning into a campaign issue.

Kelley, due to seek reelection this year, staged a series of news conferences Aug. 29 across Michigan to denounce overcharging by retailers, especially K mart and Econo Foods. He threatened legal action.

John Smietanka, whom Republicans nominated last month to challenge Kelley Nov. 8, said the Democratic incumbent has his priorities mixed up.

"Remember 33, 270 and three," said Smietanka. "The first is the number of years Kelley has been in office. He has 270 attorneys as assistants. Only three are

assigned to fight crime."

Smietanka, a former Berrien County prosecutor and U.S. district attorney, told the GOP convention that Kelley has ignored organized crime, street gangs and fraud cases, saying they are more threatening to the public than faulty price scanners in stores.

Kelley replied that local prosecutors handle the violent crimes Smietanka was talking about.

Meanwhile, a former aide to Gov. James Blanchard joined the chorus of criticism of Kelley's forays. Larry Meyer, ex-director of the Commerce Department and now chief executive of the Michigan Retailers Association, called the state's item pricing law outdated and flawed.

"The retail industry continues to

support reopening the antiquated law. It's time to bring it into the 20th century and enable consumers to take advantage of the benefits of modern technology," Meyer said.

"But we need legislative changes, not press conferences," said Meyer, adding that last May he welcomed Kelley's call to reopen the law during a series of similar news conferences.

Meyer did not indicate what the 4,000-member MRA meant by "reforms."

Kelley said his investigators checked back-to-school prices in 23 stores and found that 8.7 percent of scanner prices were inaccurate. The overwhelming majority of errors were high and only a few were low, he said.

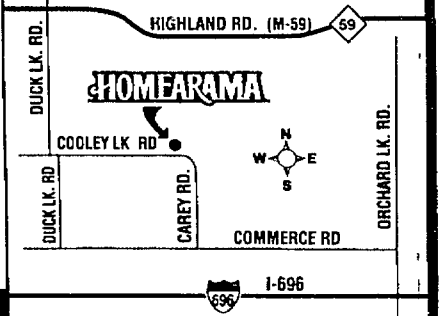

Public safety to show off SWAT, med copter

Northville Township residents: circle Sunday, Sept. 25, on your calendars. That's when you'll have a chance to see what your tax dollars pay for—and have a heck of a lot of fun—when the township's Department of Public Safety (DPS) holds its first-ever Exposition Day.

Organizers hope the event will help township residents better understand the police, fire and emergency medical services their tax dollars purchase. It's all part of a volunteer effort to get the word out about the township's millage vote coming up in November.

Proposals A and B will be on the ballot Nov. 8. Proposal A asks township voters to authorize the board of trustees to levy up to 3.84 mills per year for your years to provide police and fire services. Proposal B asks for .40 mill per year to pay for the township's share of "shared" services it jointly funds with the City of Northville: the Parks & Rec Department, Youth Assistance and senior citizen programs.

Both proposals are for the same amounts as they were on the Aug. 2 ballot, when both lost by narrow margins. Many who support A and B say that the proposals were defeated because many people

didn't understand the requests, something they intend to remedy before the November's vote.

In the past, police services have been funded by a dedicated millage. Fire services have been funded in part by a dedicated millage and by money from a general operating millage. All expire this year.

This time around, the board of trustees has decided to ask voters to fund those services through four-year dedicated millages. Both A and B, supporters stress, will pay to continue current levels of service, not to impose tax increases. If either or both go down, the board may be forced to reduce or eliminate some or all services.

The DPS Expo Day is one part of the education campaign designed to prevent that from happening. DPS Director Chip Snider recommended the idea to the board, saying that it would give voters an opportunity to learn more about what their Public Safety Department does for them.

"I think I've been remiss," Snider said at the board's Aug. 25 meeting. "People need to see the variety of services we provide."

Those range from routine police patrols to life-saving emergency medical help to the fire trucks rolling up to your home or business when there are smoke and

flames.

Expo Day will take place from noon to 4 p.m. Sept. 25 at Township Hall on Six Mile. There will be a number of interesting—and fun—things to see and do for adults and kids alike.

Want to get an up-close look at a police car or fire truck? They'll be on hand, as will the officers and firefighters who staff them, offering crime and fire prevention tips.

This area's SWAT team members will discuss their difficult and unusual task. A K-9 police dog unit will be on hand.

Northville Township's Drug Abuse Resistance Education (DARE) officer will be part of Expo

Day.

Township paramedics will take part in Expo Day, explaining and demonstrating their life-saving techniques. Also on hand will be an emergency Med-Flight helicopter, used to ferry critically injured patients to St. Joseph's Hospital in Ann Arbor.

Kids can learn how to be smart and safe when a fire breaks out with the Fire Safety House. There will even be a contest: mock "fires" that children can win prizes for putting out with a real (but low-pressure) fire hose.

McGruff and Sparky, the Crime and Fire Prevention Dogs, will be part of the Expo Day. There will be

a remote-control ambulance as well.

In addition, parents take note: DPS officials will be on hand to provide voluntary fingerprinting of your child. Parents are given the prints to keep, to be used in helping to find children in the event of a disappearance or abduction.

But that's not all. Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) etching will also be offered. Your car's VIN number is etched into its windows, making it easier to identify when stolen.


You'll have the chance to buy smoke detectors and batteries for your home, making them safer and cheaper to insure. There will be a "wellness clinic" during Expo Day—get your blood pressure checked for free.

Besides all that good stuff, there's music and food to look forward to. The legendary Detroit Police band The Blue Pigs will be on hand, as will be food vendors with plenty of munchies.

The whole slew of activities aren't expected to cost the township a cent. DPS personnel and the other individuals and citizens in and out of the township who are involved in Expo Day have volunteered their time, Snider said.

The board approved Expo Day at its last meeting on Aug. 25. The township's Zoning Board of Appeals will need to OK the plan as well; it's expected to consider the matter this month.

Grants available for merging districts

School districts thinking of consolidating can obtain \$15,000 planning grants from the Michigan Department of Education under a new budget bill.

"The Department of Education intends to offer as many grants as possible with the available funds (\$100,000)," said Robert Schiller, superintendent of public instruction.

The reason: Many small districts are struggling to meet the core curriculum requirements under Public Act 335, part of the Proposal A school reform package.

They are "faced with diminishing fiscal resources, coupled with a decline in student population during the last decade," Schiller said. "Many of the larger contiguous districts are also faced with similar problems."

Small districts may consolidate to form a new, larger district or be annexed to another district. Planning money would allow them to conduct feasibility studies.

Grants will be awarded on a competitive basis.

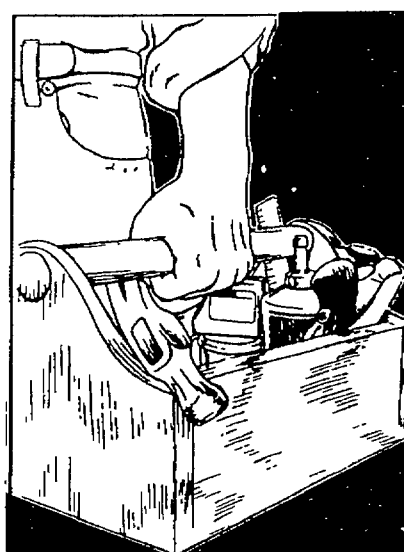

"This is a nice opportunity for people who are not inclined to go to the ball to go in and enjoy all the decorations," said Mother's Club representative Bonnie St. Thomas.

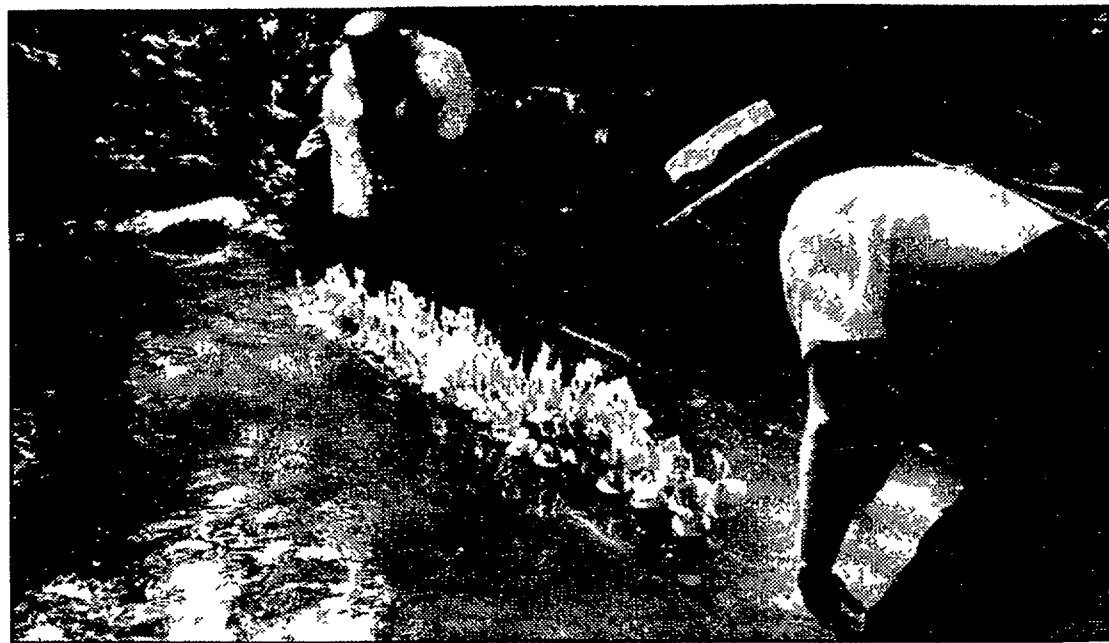

Trustees consider giving dirt roads second chloride treatment this fall

Residents of busy dirt roads in Northville Township may be in for a treat.

Actually, it's a treatment: there could be another calcium chloride treatment of the township's unpaved through-streets this fall to cut down on the dust which traffic kicks up.

That would make two for the year and would be a welcome and unexpected bonus for residents of those streets. The board of trustees at its Aug. 25 meeting, citing voters' passage of Proposal E last month, asked Director of Public Utilities Bill Anderson to see what it would cost to do another spraying later this month.

The spraying isn't part of the township's 1994 budget, but the

trustees say they're interested in following the public's wishes, as expressed in the Aug. 2 vote. Proposal E was the only one of five millage requests on the ballot to pass.

It asks for .08 mill a year for road maintenance, which the trustees said they'd use for the treatments. The .08 mill adds up to about \$8 a year for the owner of a \$200,000 home.

"This is an appropriate expense, even though it's not budgeted, in light of the fact that Proposal E passed. We've been allowed to provide that service and should start immediately," Treasurer Rick Engelland said.

Anderson will get some hard numbers on the price of the treatment, which streets will be included and where the money will come

from and report back to the board. The board earlier this summer approved a dirt road treatment which was applied in July.

Wayne County owns the roads in Northville Township and taxes residents to pay for maintenance and upkeep. However, treating the township's secondary dirt roads has fallen low on the county's priority scale.

The township took up the task in the mid-80s, paying for the

treatments from its own tax dollars. That ended in 1992 with budget cutbacks by the previous board of trustees. The current crop of officials have said they would not double-dip taxpayers unless voters said they wanted to pay for the treatments by approving Proposal E.

The four-year millage would raise about \$44,000 a year, enough for two treatments annually.

UM-D chancellor: Dearborn campus students are smart and competitive

With one ear to the ground James Renick promised, "You'll hear more about this institution. We're ready to take off. It has been an incredible one and a half years."

Renick is chancellor of the University of Michigan-Dearborn campus, which in October will break ground for \$14 million in state-funded buildings for the engineering and management schools.

His ear is to the ground because UM-D listens to employers. It was founded 35 years ago at the prompting of, and with a 200-acre land gift from, Ford Motor Co. Ford foresaw a shortage of engineers and junior managers. Nowadays, UM-D listens to the entire Big Three, and other companies besides. It does sponsored research for Perceptron, a Farmington Hills supplier of 3-D image processing equipment to the auto industry.

"We respond to the people—the needs of the community. For instance, we found, in talking with supporters and employers, there was a need to supply technical skills for managers and managerial skills for engineers. We ended

up designing a master's degree program, engineering management. It's been a runaway success."

Terry Gallagher, UM-D's information officer, added that the state won't pay to equip the forthcoming new buildings. Industry will do that.

"Partnership," a term UM-D officials often repeat, has been a buzzword in academia for several years. UM-D has been using it for 35.

"We don't believe in town and gown. We're in the same community," Renick said.

In 1984 when UM-D turned 25, its enrollment appeared to be leveling off at 6,000. Now it's up to 8,000. Renick doesn't project a cap. "We'll grow incrementally, in response to the people," he said.

Renick knows colleges. He was raised in Rockford, Ill., the son of a college professor father and a mother who was assistant superintendent of the public schools. His father died young. Renick used scholarships and fellowships to get degrees at Central State (Ohio), Kansas University and Florida State. He was vice provost for academic initiatives and external affairs at George Mason University

in Fairfax, Va., when the University of Michigan hired him in January of 1993 to lead the Dearborn campus.

UM-D is no party school. Its history contains no tales of student pranks or demonstrations. "They're smart. They work hard. They're competitive. This is the most selective division-one commuter school in the country. The top students are heavily recruited," the chancellor said.

Unlike its residential big brother in Ann Arbor, where 30 percent of all undergraduates hail from other states, UM-D is 73 percent Wayne County residents, mainly suburban, and 99 percent Michigan residents. The breakdown:

- 50 percent liberal arts (though many will switch to engineering in their junior years).
- 26 percent engineering.
- 10 percent management.
- 10 percent education.

U-M officials constantly say the Dearborn campus is comparable in quality to the Ann Arbor campus, and Renick says there is much contact on research between faculties on the two campuses.

But UM-D clearly is different with its heavy emphasis on cooperative programs—where students are placed in jobs related to their studies.

"In engineering, it's 35 percent; in management, 30; in CASL (liberal arts) it's a bit lower. In teaching, all," Renick said. Their jobs were not only in business but in the U.S. and Canadian governments.

A further benefit: Few graduate students (19 percent of the enrollment) work as teaching assistants, so freshmen and sophomores see more tenured faculty sooner than at other universities.

Biggest sources of UM-D students: Henry Ford, Schoolcraft,

Oakland and Macomb community colleges. A Catholic high school in Dearborn sees 25 percent of its graduates enroll at UM-D—at lower tuition than they paid in high school.

Lawmakers and Gov. John Engler appreciated UM-D's growth enough to boost its appropriation 4.7 percent this year while other state universities got 3 to 3.3 percent more. "It's a reaction to the growth of the campus. We have a space crunch," Renick said.

UM-D won prestige when Renick was invited to join the Business-Higher Education Forum, a 100-member group split evenly between academics and Fortune 500-type business leaders, led by retired Ford chairman Harold (Red) Poling. The group meets twice a year for several days. Topics: competitiveness, human resources, development, school reform, assistance to central and Eastern Europe.

With both chancellor Renick and President James Duderstadt in this inner circle, U-M is the only university with two members. "It says something about this campus that we're involved in national discussions," said Renick.

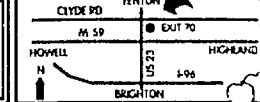

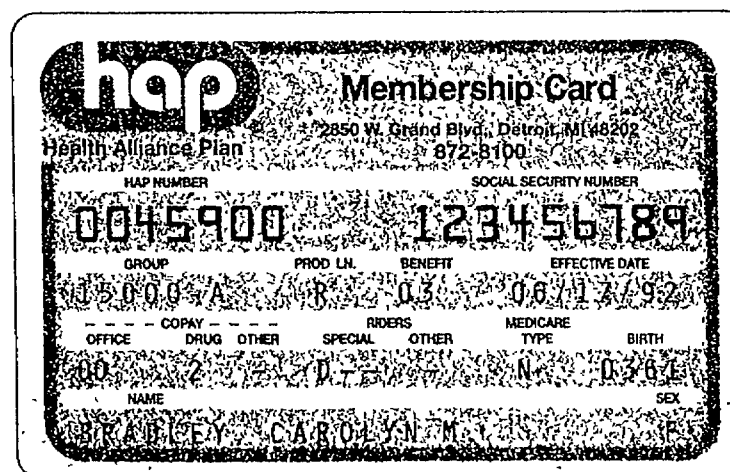

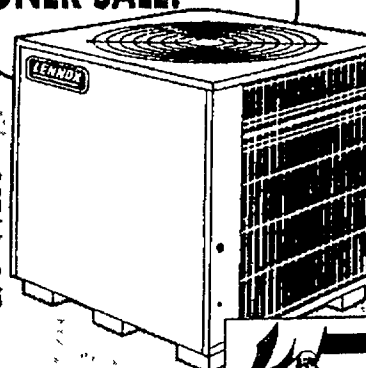

Township to study sewer flow line with eye toward selling capacity to Salem

oldest section of Salem Township—known as the Hamlet of Salem—has had problems with inadequate disposal of sewage. There are no sewers in the area.

To solve the problem, Salem officials want to install a sewer system in the hamlet and are applying for a state grant for the money to build it. They have to have a way to ship the waste for treatment, of course, and are looking to Northville Township for help.

Salem's engineers say that the best way to go is to tap the hamlet system into Northville's nearby WTUA sewer lines. Salem's board has asked for an agreement that would allow the hamlet to pump up to 50,000 gallons of waste a day into the pipeline, and they're willing to pay the township for the privilege.

That's enough for the needs of about 250 homes, what the hamlet

is expected to generate when it's built out about 20 years from now. Some 105 homes are there now.

Northville Township officials have raised concerns about the sale and the potential effect on the township's total capacity.

The WTUA system was intended to handle the sewer flow of the three communities involved in it when they are built out: Northville, Plymouth and Canton townships. Northville is the least developed of the three, perhaps decades away from complete development. Consequently, it's hard to predict how much of its available sewer flow capacity it will or will not have left over when all's said and done.

Some on the board are concerned that the capacity sold to Salem will limit Northville's ability to accommodate future development.

Other trustees say that the township is very unlikely to need

those 50,000 gallons a day because it has a huge sewer capacity excess. The sale to Salem makes sense, they say: Northville Township gets to help out a neighbor and make some money to help pay off the \$30 million WTUA construction debt.

The board agreed to a compromise proposal, tentatively approving the sale contingent on determining if the township had enough excess sewer capacity to allow for it. The board asked Director of Public Utilities Bill Anderson to seek bids from independent engineering firms to determine hard numbers for the township's total sewer capacity, WTUA and otherwise.

The selected firm, the trustees cautioned, can't have any ties to the township or its WTUA partners. Several members said they were skeptical of the capacity figures provided by the township's

regular engineering firm when WTUA was being built. Hubble's bid was the lowest of the four received, Anderson said, coming in at \$8,300.

"The firm is very reputable and competent of handling this assignment," he said in a memo to the board on the subject.

Whatever the firm finds out, trustees stressed that the township isn't bound to final approval of the Salem sale.

The board tacked three other major stipulations onto its June conditional approval: one, having the township attorney review the agreement to ensure that it doesn't violate any WTUA contracts; working out the purchase price; and Salem gaining the OK of both the WTUA board and the Ypsilanti sewer system board where some of the WTUA waste is sent for treatment.

Proposed city law tough on drinking drivers

is pulled over and is found to have a blood alcohol level of .07 percent, defined by law as visibly impaired, would be responsible for the costs of providing police, fire fighting or rescue services. The fees could even include the cost of pulling over an impaired driver and making an arrest.

Bills would be sent through the mail and would require full payment within 30 days of the incident. Any legal expenses involved in collecting the money would be added to the bill.

Council members agreed that a clause should be added to the ordinance to include the state's .04 percent blood-alcohol limit for commercial drivers.

State law has established a .10 blood alcohol level as legally drunk for motorists.

The ordinance will be introduced at the council's Sept. 19 meeting and could be enacted by

the middle of October.

Depending on the severity of the incident, impaired drivers could be responsible for fees ranging from \$200 to \$800, Word estimated.

Under the ordinance, drivers would pay for the hourly wage of fire fighting, police and emergency medical service personnel, including overtime wages, costs and expenses for special equipment used during a response and the cost of any chemical tests for blood alcohol content or for controlled substances and for videotaping of the driver.

Other area communities, including Birmingham, have similar ordinances. A copy of the Birmingham ordinance was studied by the Northville City Police Department and the city attorney.

Land buy could end lawsuit against township

for use in construction operations. Iafate officials at a board of trustees meeting in June indicated that if they bought Holloway out they'd be interested in settling his 1991 lawsuit against the township.

The Holloway firm filed the suit when the township, after months of delay and debate, turned down

a company plan to set up a mining and asphalt manufacturing plant on the land in question. The suit was filed in Wayne County Circuit Court, where it's remained ever since, waiting for a trial date.

The Iafate firm's plan for the site, however, may produce the same reaction that the Holloway plan caused among officials and residents who live near the Six and Ridge site. Many of the trustees at

the June meeting raised some of the same issues, including:

- The visibility of the plant and mining pit from nearby roads and homes.

- The odor levels of the asphalt plant.

- The noise levels and dangers from additional truck traffic and dust and road damage.

- One of the biggest questions raised was the effect of the company's plan to go below the area's water table during the 10-year life of the mine. Company officials said they had considered making the pit a lake and having residential housing nearby after the mine closed down.

Novi wants paving to mitigate wetlands loss

Novi City officials are hoping the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) will pave Garfield Road as part of its plan to mitigate wetlands lost to the Hagerty Connector.

MDOT plans to build a 35-acre wetland at Nine Mile and Garfield roads and is expected to seek bids on the work sometime this month or in October.

The job will require removing 400,000 cubic yards of earth from the site. Novi officials have already asked that the trucks doing the work not use Nine Mile Road.

"The major concern is what's going to happen to Garfield Road with all the trucks going in and out of it. I don't know what's going to happen. We will wait and see,"

City Manager Ed Kriewall said last week.

"The City Council wants to do a resolution on paving Garfield."

City officials have already told MDOT that the truck traffic would kick up too much dust on the unpaved Garfield Road, where about 20 residents live. They also contend that the gravel street will not bear up under the heavy traffic. About 8,000 hauling trips are anticipated in the project.

Novi has already asked MDOT not to route the trucks down Nine Mile Road, because that could require the trimming of trees along that winding portion of Nine Mile. Instead, the trucks will likely take Garfield south to Eight Mile road, where MDOT staff have said a temporary traffic signal will be installed.

Fast acting coworkers save man

Kevin Prievie died three times on Aug. 2.

He wouldn't be here today to talk about it if it hadn't been for the coworkers who had the presence of mind to keep him alive.

Prievie, then 41, had been working just over two weeks at the Marbelite Corporation on Heslip Drive in Novi when he collapsed while loading a customer's truck. He doesn't remember anything about it, but his coworker Tom lafrate recalls the day clearly.

"The driver jumped down. I heard him say, 'Is this guy having a seizure?' Kevin was laying on the ground. It didn't look like a seizure," lafrate said.

lafrate was on target. Prievie had had a massive heart attack.

lafrate knew that a coworker, Tom Swartz, was trained in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), so he raced to get him. Meanwhile, Linda Winberg, another employee who also knew CPR, dashed over.

"The doctors said I wouldn't be here if it wasn't for them. If you go to the emergency room, they only give you CPR for 10 minutes," Prievie said last week.

"The hospital report says I died three times."

Swartz, a drill sergeant in the Army Reserves, is required to be

certified in CPR.

"When I first went in, my mind went blank. Then it all came back," he said.

Winberg learned CPR three years earlier and at first was "real nervous" because she was afraid she'd forgotten how to do it. But that didn't happen.

Swartz gave Prievie mouth-to-mouth resuscitation while Winberg massaged his chest. lafrate then spelled her, getting on-the-job training because he'd never learned CPR.

At first Prievie had no pulse, but after a few minutes he came around. Then, his pulse stopped but they kept working on him until Prievie responded.

His three coworkers administered the CPR for 10 minutes or more until the ambulance arrived and Prievie was carted off to Botsford Hospital. The diagnosis was that his two-and-a-half packs of cigarettes a day habit almost killed him.

"They told me it was all due to smoking. They said it was nicotine aggravating plaque in my arteries and it closed one artery," Prievie explained.

"Everybody said 'you're lucky to be alive'. The doctor said 'you were in the right place at the right time.'"

Prievie said the physicians noted

that if the CPR had not been administered correctly he might have suffered brain damage due to lack of oxygen.

Prievie had only been working at Marbelite, which manufactures cast polymer bathroom fixtures, for over two weeks when he had his heart attack. Just a few weeks earlier, he'd gotten a clean bill of health in a pre-employment physical exam.

Prievie retired from the Army in June and returned to the U.S. after seven months in Saudi Arabia. Now, the Howell resident expects to his doctors to give him the okay on Sept. 23 to return to Marbelite.

While he's eager to get back to work, Prievie says he also plans to sign up for a CPR class: "You never know. Maybe one day it'd be my turn to help somebody."

lafrate, Swartz and Winberg, meanwhile, are enjoying the new television sets they were awarded by Marbelite for a job well done. The firm's president, Larry Morianti, said the plant plays a daily safety Bingo with prizes to encourage workers to cut down on accidents.

"We figured that was the ultimate in safety, to save an individual's life, so we bought three TV sets. They didn't win at Bingo but they won at life," Morianti said.

Drinking law would send signal to drivers

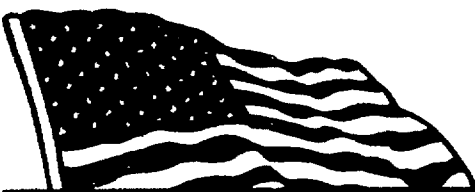
Northville is a great place to do a lot of things—shop, browse, relax, explore a little history.

But if the Northville City Council follows through on a new ordinance proposal, it'll be a nightmare of a place to drink through while drunk. And the city will be better off for it.

Council members at a meeting Tuesday night gave initial consideration to a resolution that would impose stiff fines on stiff drivers. Under the ordinance, people caught driving with a .07 blood alcohol level could be forced to pay a host of fees, including the hourly wages of the public safety personnel who have to process violations.

Michigan state law defines inebriation as .1 percent, but .07 is considered visibly impaired.

The proposal was modeled on similar laws now on the books in Birmingham and other cities. It would empower authorities to charge drivers for the costs of lab work and emergency runs, in addition to the wages police and medical technicians ring up during the course of their duties. Even expenses associated with pulling over and

arresting motorists could be passed along to offenders.

City Manager Gary Word says costs for a single incident could add up to as much as \$800.

As is the case with all laws, it's no panacea, but taken in combination with other, tougher drunk driving measures we believe such an ordinance could only help. Beside hitting drinkers where it hurts most—the pocketbook—the law would help send a signal to motorists that tolerance of drunk driving is an endangered sentiment.

It's all part of the effort to raise consciousness about the fact that an automobile is a potentially deadly weapon, and that an impaired driver is a potential unwitting killer.

School salaries are in line with the times

The Northville Board of Education has approved salary increases for the district's top administrators, and in many cases the bottom-line figures add up to eye popping sums.

Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski, \$116,571; Assistant Superintendent Dolly McMaster, \$99,469; Special Ed Director Bob Sornson, \$85,228.

Throw in goodies like fringe benefits, expenses and annuities and you've got some well-healed individuals calling the shots in local public education.

Yet, in spite of the impressive dollar amounts, the increases are reasonable by at least two measures: 1) when viewed as percentages over last year's rates, and 2) when compared with what educators in similar districts are paid.

On the first count, Rezmierski's increase represented the superintendent's first raise in three years. It amounted to 3 percent. McMaster's raise also totaled 3 percent, as did that of Assistant Superintendent Dave Bolitho, whose salary went up to \$96,744.

Regarding the second point, the adminis-

trators' salaries are competitive with those of other school district managers, and that is the ultimate yardstick by which to measure reasonableness. Few people would set the value of a football player's contribution to society at \$3 million a year, yet many professional athletes make that much or more. In order to attract quality personnel, an employer—any employer—must compensate at the going rate. The maxim, "You get what you pay for," applies to services as well as to goods.

Northville school district parents and taxpayers pay their administrators and teachers well and have a right to insist on high levels of performance and responsiveness. But few can dispute the fact that in rewarding its employees handsomely, the school district is only following a statewide norm.

Yo, I think we're lost, gang

I'm definitely packing a world atlas in my survival kit as soon as I get around to stuffing the knap sack that's gathering dust in the corner of my room. I'll wedge the volume right in between the hunting knife and the C-Rations.

Granted, I won't be able to splice rope with it or dish it out of a can, but at least I'll know the name of the deserted South Pacific island I'll have to call home until a ship comes to rescue me.

And that, apparently, will put me far ahead of other Americans, most of whom don't seem to know which hemisphere they live in. At least that's the conclusion of a recent Gallup survey completed for the National Geographic Society, a copy of which was sent to me here at the newspaper (just one of the many perks of the job!).

The poll was designed to assess the geographic literacy of Americans compared to citizens of other nations. Over 10,000 people 18 and older were interviewed worldwide to get the findings.

How'd we do? Somewhere between lousy and atrocious. And that was on a good day.

According to Gallup:

- 56 percent of American adults don't know the population of the United States (roughly 260 million).

- One in three Americans can't name any of the members of NATO (try the good old USA, for one). Half the respondents bestowed NATO membership on the former Soviet Union, the country the alliance was formed to keep in check.

- Only 5 percent could pick out England among the nations of Europe.

- One in seven (14 percent) could not find the United States on a world map.

- Only 55 percent correctly identified New York state on a map of the continental U.S. (in struggling to find the place, people pointed at a total of 37 different states, including some on the west coast).

Now here comes the really bad news. Compared to control groups in eight other countries, our mapless wonders fared better than only two. Adults in Japan, Sweden, the UK, France, Germany and Canada bested us. Only respondents from Italy and Mexico did worse.

Among those 18 to 24, we were dead last, though I'll bet Americans in that age group can circumnavigate a 54-channel cable circuit with the adeptness of a Ferdinand Magellan.

In addition, American adults are worse amateur geographers now than 40 years ago, in spite of the explosion of information brought about by the proliferation of the personal computer.

To confirm the sad truth of the Gallup poll, I conducted a little unscientific study of my own. Here's what I found:

- Three of five members of my family thought El Salvador was the brand name of a soft taco shell.

- Six of seven persons selected at random on the street said Madagascar was a new compact Chrysler.

- Nine of 10 revelers quizzed at Woodstock '94 believed Mongolia was a cocker spaniel/Alaskan malamute mix.

- Ten of 12 people stopped in the mall identified Moscow as a milk-producing farm animal.

- 100 percent of chain letter participants said Cologne, Germany, was what they bought their dad for Father's Day.

I'd say we were all headed for hell in a hand basket except we'd probably never get there.

Seriously, there can be little excuse for ignorance on the scale revealed by the Gallup survey. As the document properly proclaims: "Basic geography is not nuclear physics."

Seventeen people want to be Novi Planning commissioners.

I think that's great. It shows a real commitment from people interested in getting active and steering the course of Novi's future. It shows a real interest in preserving and protecting Novi's future.

Or does it?

How many of the 17 applicants really want to be commissioners or how many have an axe to grind with city officials over the recent approval of Interlock Corp's plan to build a factory there?

We may never know the answer to that one. But I suspect there are several applicants angry enough about the Interlock outcome to want to jump on board and see it changed.

It's good to see people get involved in the community—even if they jump on the band wagon because of a single issue. That's healthy as long as they realize when they get sworn in that they have to agree to represent the best interests of all of Novi and not just the single-issue groups that spurred their interest.

Those close to the Interlock debacle said interest in the two vacant planning commission seats was triggered by

the controversial approval of the Interlock plan. Opponents of the plan say they applied for the position because they are concerned about the commission and the direction commissioners are taking.

What direction is that, I wonder?

As far as I knew, commissioners are guided in their deliberations by the city's master plan for land use. The map details sections of the city which have been designated for varying degrees of residential, industrial and commercial growth. Individual requests are evaluated based on their own merit. Approvals and denials are determined by the project's compliance with city zoning ordinances and compatibility with adjacent uses.

There are ordinances and processes in place that are there to protect the quality of life in Novi as it is today. In fact, some say Novi ordinances are so restrictive entrepreneurs are taking their developments to communities east and west of the city to win approval.

The result is becoming obvious. Look to the east and west on Grand River Avenue and see what Novi has missed out on. Commercial and industrial developments are thriving outside the city's limits.

Here, on the inside, the same are fighting to stay alive.

District ill served by school officials

To the Editor:
The purpose of this letter is to bring to the attention of the citizens of Northville the gross lack of expertise with which our school district has been served by the Northville School Board and the Northville Public School's administration.

The Northville school district underwent a redrawing of elementary school boundaries for the school year beginning in August 1994 due to the opening of a new elementary school in the district.

Last spring, the board was presented with evidence of the potential disparity in class sizes between Amerman School and Moraine School in the event the board voted in favor of the redistricting plan (which plan was indeed implemented). The board and the administration did not seriously consider the information concerning class sizes that was presented to them at that time.

Approximately four days before school started (around Aug. 26), the board and the administration came to the sudden realization that a great disparity existed between class sizes at Amerman and Moraine in kindergarten, first and fifth grades.

At the eleventh hour, just three days before the start of the new school year, families with children in Amerman's kindergarten, first and fifth grades received letters in the mail advising them of the disparity in class sizes and giving them the option of transferring their kindergarten, first-grader or fifth-grader to Moraine.

No parent should ever have to find him or herself in the situation of having to sell the idea of attending a new school, different from the one siblings are attending, different from the one neighborhood friends are attending, to a 5-, 6- or 9-year old just three days before the start of the school year. A lot of anguish is experienced and a lot of tears are shed in the interest of getting the best education possible for that

child.
I resent having been put in the situation described above. I am angry at the board's failure, last spring, to carefully consider the evidence presented to them showing the obvious problems with overloading Amerman with new students while under-utilizing Moraine.

The board's and administration's actions send a clear message to the Northville school community that the board and administration have little concern for class and school size.

There are an abundance of recent studies showing an inverse correlation between class size and quality of education. If our administrators and school board members are as concerned about quality of education as they say they are, their actions should reflect an effort to decrease class size and school population by better utilizing our school facilities and/or, if necessary, hiring more teachers, instead of just paying lip-service to the issue.

Given the other recent questionable decisions by the school board and administration, such as the shortening of the Wednesday high school day, the sale of real estate owned by Northville Public Schools to a developer without taking bids from competing parties, and giving priority to the hiring of additional school buses over the hiring of additional teachers, we need to ask whether the board and the administration are truly acting in the best interest of our children and in the best interest of the taxpayers of Northville.

It is time to hold the members of the school board and the school administrators accountable for their decisions.

Don't forget helmets, skaters

She mentioned several pieces of safety equipment necessary when skating, such as wrist guards, knee pads and elbow pads. I would like to address an additional piece of safety gear that is of utmost importance: a protective helmet.

As a speech-language pathologist, I currently work in a private rehabilitation practice with adults who have sustained traumatic brain injuries. The process of brain injury rehabilitation is a long one, generally measured in years rather than months. As stated by the Michigan Head Injury Alliance (MHIA), "Research, rehabilitation, public awareness, and prevention can help lessen the occurrence of brain injuries in our society."

Statistics reported by the MHIA from the Interagency Head Injury Task Force Report (February 1989) indicate that traumatic brain injury is the leading killer and cause of disability in children and young adults. Additionally, every 16 seconds a brain injury occurs in the United States.

Prevention is the key. When bike riding, even "just in the neighborhood," or in-line skating, please wear a helmet. Parents: be a safety model for your children by wearing a helmet too. Let's not give them the wrong idea about helmets—they are for everyone, not just children.

"The best protection against brain injury is prevention."

City/state battles are healthy

Fred Warner, a former Farmington village president, was governor of Michigan in 1908-9, when the state adopted one of the great reforms of the 20th century—municipal home rule.

Local governments are creatures of the state and have only the powers the state gives them. Across the U.S. in the 19th century, however, state legislators had abused their control. Cities demanded home rule so they could experiment with new forms of governance, such as city managers, at-large councils, nonpartisan elections, appointed clerks and treasurers, higher taxing and bonding authority, and so on.

Yet the tension between state and cities continues. Covering the school reform action of 1993-4, I had to bypass a few good stories about home rule. Let's catch up:

DAY CARE—The Senate passed SB 162, sponsored by Sen. Jack Faxon, D-Farmington Hills, which limits cities' abilities to zone out day-care centers. The Michigan Municipal League, composed of cities and villages, is battling it because "In its present form, the bill amends the City and Village Zoning Act to allow a day care facility with up to six children to locate in any residential zone."

Snob zoning is a fairly familiar abuse of home rule powers, particularly in newer suburbs. At MML's request, Rep. Jan Dolan, R-Farmington Hills, a former mayor, will offer an amendment exempting "a city or village whose zoning ordinance makes a good faith inclusionary provision for family day care homes and group day care homes in all residential zones."

Many lawmakers distrust the vagueness of the Dolan amendment. What is "good faith"? We should see a dandy floor fight during the House's fall session.

RESIDENCY—Senate Bill 579 would prohibit cities from requiring

that police and fire personnel live within their boundaries. It is sponsored by Sen. David Honigman of West Bloomfield.

Honigman's purpose is not "Detroit bashing." He sees the restrictions as out of date, disrupting the homes of married couples who both work but in different jurisdictions. He plans to report the bill out of the Labor Committee this fall.

MML promises "to vigorously oppose the bill." It will be a fight. Rep. Lynn Blankes, R-Redford, has introduced an identical measure, HB 4650, in the House, and it has gone nowhere.

POWER LINES—Senate Bills 814-821 would allow the state Public Service Commission to designate when a high-voltage powerline is a public necessity. PSC would issue a "certificate of public convenience and necessity."

MML objects: "This certificate renders all local zoning ordinances along the proposed powerline unenforceable."

Sen. John Schwarz, R-Battle Creek, sponsored the bills after Consumers Power Co. lost a court battle to extend power lines into Indiana. The utility said a single township stymied the project by objecting to a small portion of the entire line passing through its jurisdiction.

Michigan runs into such problems constantly. Should a single local unit be able to stymie a power line? a landfill? a boat launch? a hiking trail? a prison?

These local-state struggles are constant, and they are necessary—just like the struggles between police powers and defendants' rights, between labor unions and management, between individuals and the collective will.

If this newspaper is still publishing 100 years from now, my successor will be writing about these tensions. That is good. If one side ever entirely wins, the other may explode.

Fair to present composting start to finish

The worm turns.

And wiggles and eats and does its wormy business. By the time it and its companions, as well as their slimy offspring, are through doing all that, you could have enough stuff to fertilize your plants.

To a non-gardener, all this could seem, frankly, pretty gross. Not so, according to Lauren Paul.

Paul is one of 20 certified Oakland County Master Gardeners who, in cooperation with the MSU Cooperative Extension Services, will present the second annual Compost Fair at the Tollgate 4-H Education Center on Saturday.

Natural fertilizer created by composting decreases a homeowner's dependency on store-bought fertilizers that are full of chemicals.

"It's recommended for everyone

to do. It's very ecological and very safe as far as lawns," says Paul, a vegetable gardener.

With the state soon to ban the flow of yard wastes into landfills, the goal of the fair is to teach people how to create backyard or boxed compost piles.

That includes Rubbermaid-style worm compost boxes which can be stored in the basement or garage.

Gardeners use the two foot by two foot boxes to house the small Red Wiggler worms, then toss in household waste such as kitchen scraps, shredded newspapers and earth.

"The worm will eat that stuff. Their cast-off, the worm waste, is an excellent fertilizer," Paul explained.

Don't worry about an overpowering stench when you open up the bin to add more scraps.

"It's kind of an earthy odor. Unless you put in a lot of food.

Then it could smell like garbage," she said.

Composting on a grander scale is becoming a popular backyard pursuit, generally as a place to put grass clippings. The fair will tell interested folks how to build and use a backyard bin or how to get composting going in store-bought bin.

City ordinances regulate just what can be heaped onto compost pile.

"Hopefully, it's yard waste. But a lot of things can be composted you probably wouldn't think of, such as dust from vacuum cleaners and clothes dryers, paper napkins, hair from your self and your pets and used coffee filters," Paul said.

Master gardeners and composters will also explain the art of turning the compost. Paul explained that composters must allow for a blend of fresh greens

and dried clippings such as twigs and leaves, to avoid unpleasant aromas.

"There really isn't any strong odor if you use the right combination of green material and brown material. You have a pleasant, earthy smell," she added.

"If the soil doesn't have the proper nutrients, your garden won't grow."

The Compost Fair runs Saturday from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. Tollgate is at the northwest corner of Twelve Mile and Meadowbrook roads.

The free event will include demonstrations on composting an turning the pile, hands on composting opportunities for kids, organic gardening and demonstration gardening.

Retiree uses extra time to spruce up historical site

Maybe you don't have to be a retired man for the volunteering that Arthur Rockall does, but he is one and this is what he does with some of his time.

It's active stuff indoors and out at Mill Race Historical Village, the place the Northville Historical Society created in 1972.

Of course if you don't know about it, Mill Race is the living museum on Griswold Street—an assemblage of buildings that used to stand in various places in Victorian times.

For three or four hours one morning a week Rockall is on the scene working on things like this:

- Laying floors and putting up dry wall for the Blacksmith Shop.
- Making new steps for the Wash Oak School.
- Tearing open the inside of Cody House, and putting in new walls and plumbing because the bathrooms had to be moved.

- Trimming trees.
- Picking up around the buildings.
- Also when a "Historic District" sign needs replacing, he helps make a new one. (That's of course not in Mill Race, but the Society assumes the responsibility.)

The city cuts the grass at Mill Race, he said, because the city owns the property. The Historic Society is responsible for taking care of the property and raising funds to maintain the buildings, all of which are heated and have running water.

Raising the \$50,000 a year to maintain Mill Race is another story, and Arthur Rockall is concerned about that, to, because he is a member of the board.

Tickets now on sale for Town Hall lecture series

A former U.S. senator, a Ukrainian pianist, a wine expert and a network news correspondent are among the celebrity speakers lined up for Northville Town Hall's 34th season.

On Monday, Oct. 10, former Sen. William Proxmire will take the podium to discuss his 30-some year career in politics.

His start came in 1950 when he was elected to the Wisconsin State Assembly. Seven years later, he was elected to the U.S. Senate in a spring election to fill the seat left vacant by the death of Sen. Joseph McCarthy.

Proxmire was reelected four more times and retired in 1988 after dedicating his life to public service.

The senator has the longest unbroken record in the history of the Senate in answering roll call votes. Since April of 1966, there have been over 10,000 roll call votes. The average senator missed more than 950 of those.

Proxmire did not miss a single one.

Pianist Victoria Solonina is the scheduled speaker for the Nov. 14 lecture.

She has been praised by critics and musicians as a pianist with insightful and a highly expressive interpretative style. In her unique lecture/recital, Solonina will combine her musical talents with a compelling personal story.

Born in the Ukraine in 1957 to

the family of a doctor and a mathematician, Solonina grew up as the true child of insurrection. Even though it was a long time since the Russian Communists had conquered her motherland, Ukraine, Solonina's family chose to oppose communism.

Reality was painful. At school, Communists forced her to study atheism and scientific communism.

Solonina's passion for music began at age 4 when she entered the conservatory, under the guidance of world-renown pianists Ludwig Gunzburg and Emil Gilels.

After graduation, Solonina was invited to join the conservatory staff as a concertmaster and professor. While a member of the conservatory, Solonina toured the Soviet Union with solo recitals and orchestra concerts.

In 1986, a miraculous set of circumstances enabled her to undertake a concert tour to England and leap to freedom by applying for asylum to the United States.

Wine expert Michael Ashington-Pickett will speak to Town Hall ticket holders Monday, March 13.

Born, raised and educated in England, Ashington-Pickett was given his first taste of wine at the age of three.

Although a civil engineer by profession, Ashington-Pickett has traveled extensively throughout the world visiting wineries and vineyards. In 1961, he moved to the



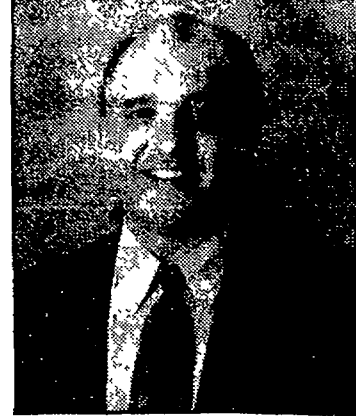

United States where he founded and operated a construction company in Florida.

In 1982 he was made an "offer he couldn't refuse" for his business and he was able to concentrate on other interests—travel, journalism and his first love, wine.

Ashington-Pickett takes the position of consumer advocate. He deplores lowering values and standards. He decided the one way to improve quality was to found and publish "The Ashington-Pickett Airlines Report."

In 1984, a second publication, "The Ashington-Pickett Travel Report" came into being. Its purpose is to rate and critique the performances of hotels and restaurants in business cities and resorts

worldwide.

Unable to resist the opportunity to offer practical, down-to-earth advice on wine to his readers, Ashington-Pickett included a regular wine column in "The Airline Report." The response was so enthusiastic it led to the launching, in 1992, of "The Ashington-Pickett Wine Review."

The speaker will combine both topics in his lecture.

Senior correspondent for NBC's magazine program NOW with Tom Brokaw and Katie Couric, Fred Francis is the scheduled speaker for the Monday, April 10, Town Hall lecture.

Prior to this assignment for the Wednesday night show, Francis was the chief Pentagon correspon-

dent for nine years, serving as the network's defense and national security affairs expert.

The journalist has won the coveted DuPont Award and a national news Emmy. He will continue using his expertise in international affairs on the prime time TV show.

Francis was NBC's principle reporter during the Persian Gulf War, often breaking developments on an exclusive basis from the Defense Department where he had been posted since September 1984.

Most recently Francis has reported on nuclear weapons proliferation in Pakistan, Iran, South Africa, North Korea and Israel. He has done extensive reporting on the prospects of American women

preparing for combat roles, gays in the military and the downsizing of the Department of Defense.

In the lavish action-adventure "The Shadow," Penelope Ann Miller stars as Margo Lane, a young woman who discovers the secret heart of Lamont Cranston (Alec Baldwin), also known as The Shadow.

The Shadow still thrills

He was the first — and greatest — of the legendary crime fighters. In pulp novels and on a long-running radio series, in theatrical serials and in comic books, The Shadow has thrilled generations.

From his creation in 1931 as the novelty host of a thriller-anthology radio series to his current portrayal in "The Shadow," a lavish action-adventure starring Alec Baldwin (Malice, The Hunt for Red October), this complex hero — embodying an inextricable conflict between light and darkness — has exerted a powerful fascination.

This latest incarnation of "The Shadow" remains true to its pulp and radio roots, putting a contemporary spin on the best-remembered elements of the original. These include The Shadow's occult ability to "cloud men's minds" and thus become virtually invisible (except for the telltale shadow that gave the character his name), as well as his playboy alter ego, Lamont Cranston. Also playing a key role in the feature film are the army of "agents" who aid The Shadow in his war on crime.

Penelope Ann Miller (Carlito's Way, Kindergarten Cop) joins Baldwin as Margo Lane, Lamont Cranston's strong-willed friend and companion. John Lone (The Last Emperor) is Shivan Khan, a ruthless adversary who matches his occult powers against The Shadow's in a deadly battle for the fate of humanity.

The impressive supporting cast includes Peter Boyle (The Dream Team), Ian McKellen (Tony Award-winner for Amadeus), Jonathan Winters (It's a Mad, Mad, Mad, Mad World) and Tim Curry (The Rocky Horror Picture Show, The Three Musketeers).

The film is directed by Russell Mulcahy from an original screenplay by David Koepp whose credits include "Jurassic Park" and "Carlito's Way." The Bregman/Baer Production is released by Universal Pictures.

For the filmmakers, the most important element of the film was the complex psyche of The Shadow himself — as well as the actor who

could embody those qualities on the screen. Alec Baldwin eagerly took on the challenge of playing Lamont Cranston and The Shadow, intrigued by the character's dual nature.

"People are always drawn to characters where there's a lot of mystery," said Baldwin. "Take the most famous line from 'The Shadow' — 'Who knows what evil lurks in the hearts of men?' Well, The Shadow really does know. He's been there. He's not some boy scout who decided to put on a costume and go out and fight crime."

"The Shadow" begins in Tibet where Cranston — hated and feared as Yink Ko, the "Butcher of Lhasa" — rules a criminal empire with a bloody hand. Then Cranston is taken captive by an ageless mystic known only as The Tulku, who serenely informs him: "You have no choice. You will be redeemed." Through long and torturous years of training, Cranston learns the secret powers of the mind, and is made a dread nemesis of evil — The Shadow.

Despite his grim resolve to serve the cause of justice, The Shadow is troubled by past crimes and inner turmoil. Shivan Khan — conceived by the filmmakers as The Shadow's dark mirror — recognizes Cranston's inner conflict and seeks to turn it to his advantage. "Shivan Khan" and Cranston both studied under the same master and Khan has all The Shadow's powers," said John Lone, who plays Khan. "Unlike The Shadow, however, Khan uses his powers only to dominate the wills of others. He sees people only as tools. By luring Cranston to his side, he hopes to gain an ally in his dreams of conquest."

For Baldwin, the relationship of The Shadow and Shivan Khan is "a lot like a Warner Brothers gangster movie where a guy from the old neighborhood comes to the hero and says, 'Hey, Terry. It's me, Joey. Let's go steal some cars.' That's really what Khan is saying to Cranston: 'Come on. Let's go take over the world.'"

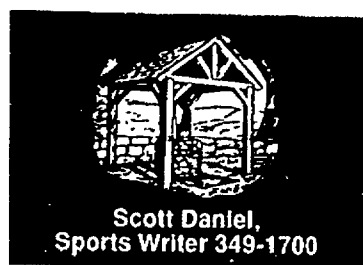

The Mustang mentor has spent the last several months studying the latest swimming techniques. Since practice began in mid-August, Dicks has imparted that newfound wisdom on his Northville High swimmers.

Much to his delight, the tankers are picking up the program. So much so, in fact, that Northville managed a second place finish at the Plymouth Relays Thursday.

Livonia Stevenson won the meet with 270 points while the Mustangs were second with 224 points. Dicks said the new program helped his team to that finish despite the fact that their conditioning was off.

"As out of shape as they are they felt good in the

water," he said. "I couldn't have been happier if we had won going away."

The program concentrates on body-position in the water. The idea is to reduce drag and thereby produce faster swims.

After stopping South Lyon on four plays, they took the ball on their own 41 yard line. Anel

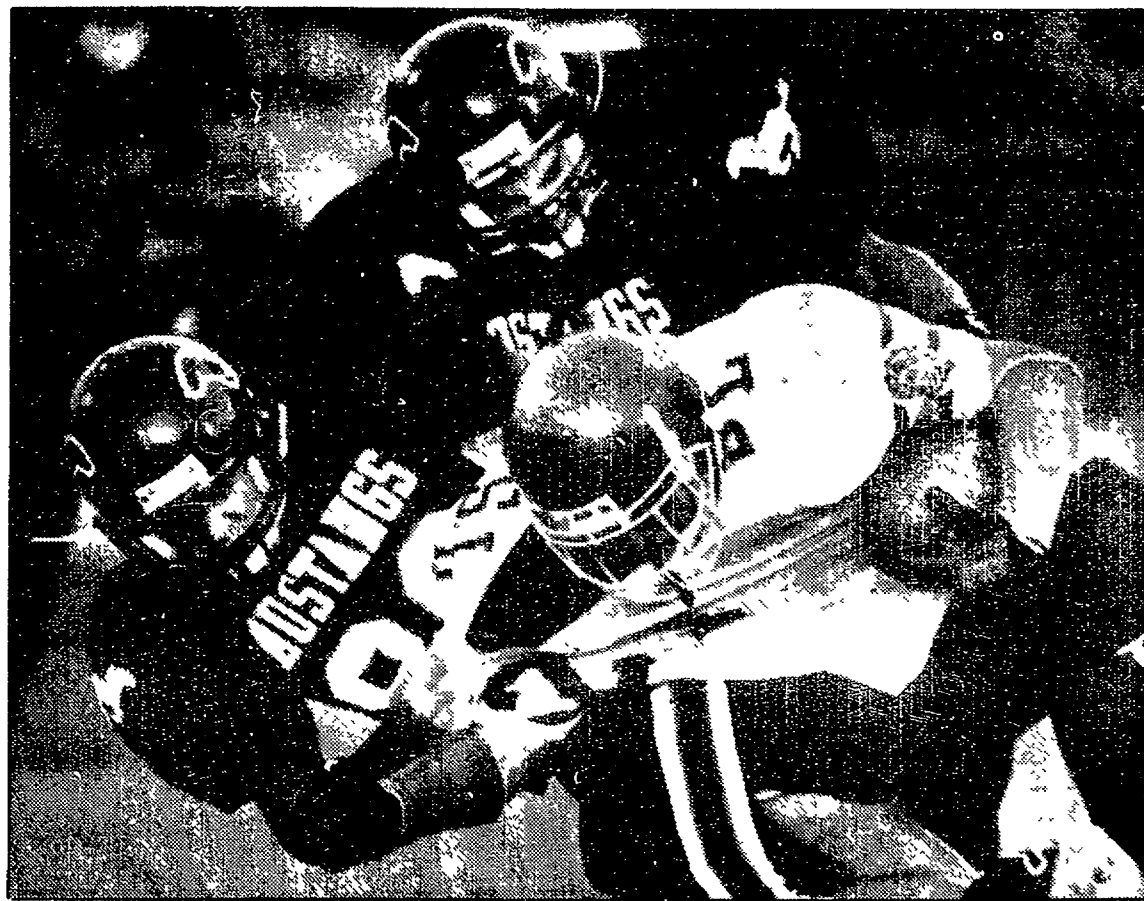

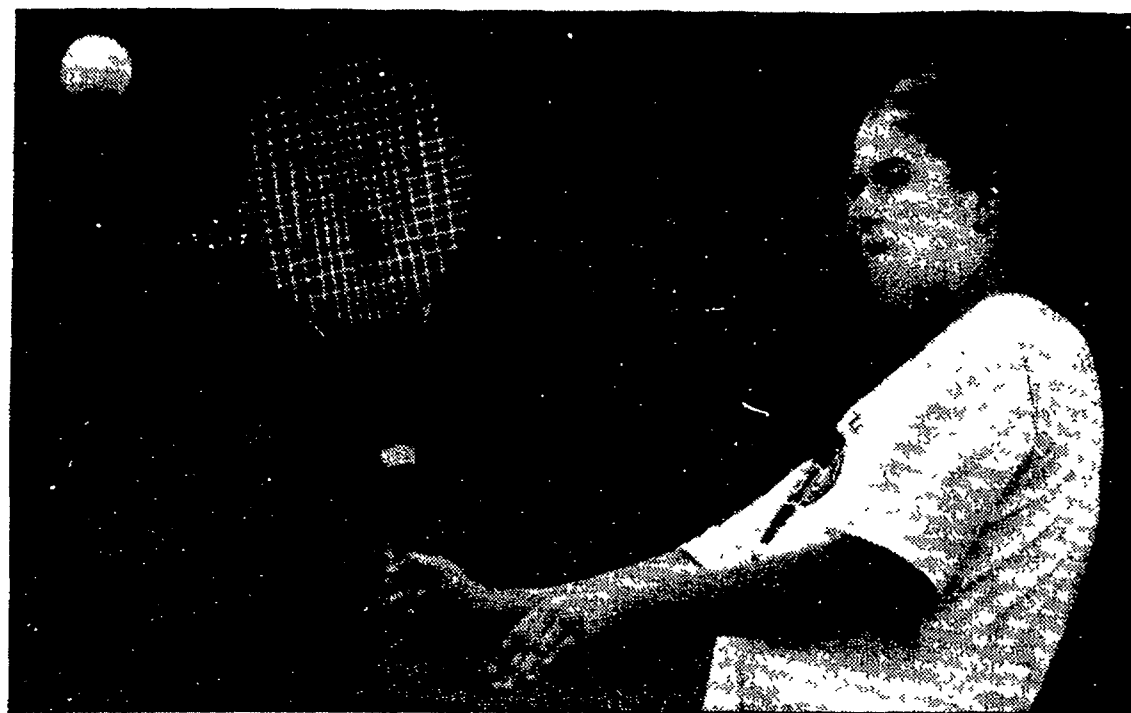

Makes 14-16 sandwiches
2 Lawash whole wheat soft crackers.
(Lawash, pronounced la-vosh, crackers are approximately 8 inches in diameter and can be found in packets of six at many stores in Southeast Michigan.)
1/2 recipe pesto spread*** (recipe follows)

1 1/2 C. (packed) fresh spinach leaves, measured after washing and roasting
1 med. red pepper, roasted*** and cut into julienne strips
6 ozs. mushrooms, sliced (8 medium)
1/2 medium avocado, thinly sliced
1 tsp. freshly squeezed lemon or lime juice (sprinkle over the avocado to retard discoloration)
4 ozs. alfalfa sprouts (1 1/2 C. packed); onion sprouts can be substituted
1-2 green onions shredded

****To roast a red pepper:** Skewer and hold over a gas flame, rotating to get all sides evenly charred. If you don't have a gas flame, place on the highest setting under your broiler. Allow to cool in a sealed lunch bag, which gives it a smoky flavor. When cool, remove the charred skin, core and seed, then cut into julienne strips.

*****To make pesto spread:** Yield 8 1/4 oz.
1 C. nonfat yogurt, drained to yield one cup (235 g or 8 ozs.)
See yogurt consistencies, p. 34, High Fit-Low Fat cookbook
2 Tbs. olive oil
1 1/2 tsp. pine nuts
1 small clove garlic, finely chopped
1 Tbs. freshly grated Parmesan cheese (10 g or 1/2 oz.)
2 Tbs. (generous) fresh basil leaves (20 g)
1/2 tsp. salt

Combine all ingredients except the yogurt, blend or pulverize in a mortar and pestle, then stir in the yogurt

Method:
-Spread Lawash evenly with the pesto spread, then layer the vegetables evenly over the entire cracker one inch from the edge.
-Roll the cracker firmly, but not too tightly, into a roll, wrap in a clean dish towel, then seal in a plastic bag for at least two hours or overnight.

Weight control takes exercise, diet

Many people look at weight control as an either-or proposition—diet versus exercise. It takes both.

Your body obtains calories through food. It either uses calories for energy or stores them as fat.

To maintain body weight, your intake and expenditure of calories must be equal. For example, if you normally consume 2,800 calories a day, you must expend enough energy (through metabolic and physical activity) to utilize those 2,800 calories. If you have 100 calories left over, they go into storage. Save 3,500 calories and you've gained a pound. Conversely, the loss of one pound of fat requires a loss of 3,500 calories.

One pound a week—that's what most authorities agree is a sensible weight loss program. To reach that goal, your caloric deficit would have

to be 500 calories a day. Yes, you could do it by diet alone, but exercise offers three important advantages.

First, regular exercise permits a higher caloric intake while you diet.

Second, exercise can be an enjoyable leisure time activity which improves cardiovascular fitness.

Finally, weight loss through exercise consists primarily of fat. With crash or fad diets, you also lose water and vital lean tissue. When you resume a balanced diet, you will quickly regain the lost water and lean tissue.

The purpose of losing weight is to reduce body fat stores rather than lean tissue or water. Thus, the best way to lose weight is through reduced caloric intake and increased physical activity. Be patient.

A pound-a-week weight loss has been found to be more permanent than rapid weight loss.

Q: Is it true that mild exercise is best for weight reduction?

A: Lower-intensity exercise will burn more fat and lead to greater weight loss only when you exercise longer. Total caloric expenditure,

rather than exercise intensity, is the most important determinant of weight loss from exercise.

Running consumes more calories per mile. A 180-pound man burns about 94 calories walking a mile and 140 calories running it.

More than 90 percent of women and 66 percent of men can attain a minimum "threshold" intensity for training (i.e., above 70 percent of their maximal heart rate) by brisk walking alone.

Q: I see bicyclists with seats set high and seats set low. Is there a right way to adjust the seat so I won't tire so easily?

A: When riding a stationary or outdoor bicycle, adjust the seat height so there is a slight bend at the knee at maximal leg extension. If the seat is too low, your leg muscles will easily fatigue, limiting performance.

After a little tinkering with alignment, Novi's James Cini, Jason Clemens, Jason Wisely, Sevy Martin and Scott Morrison opened gaping holes in Walled Lake Western's line.

As a result, the Wildcats scored touchdowns in each of the final three quarters and racked up more than 300 yard offensively. Jason Witherspoon and Jim Harrington led the charge with more than 100 yards each in rushing.

Perhaps the game's key play occurred right after the short team conference.

Novi stopped Walled Lake on downs at its own 37-yard line. Three plays later, Witherspoon took a John Wroe hand off, darted through the line and galloped 49 yards for a touchdown at the 3:55 mark of the second quarter.

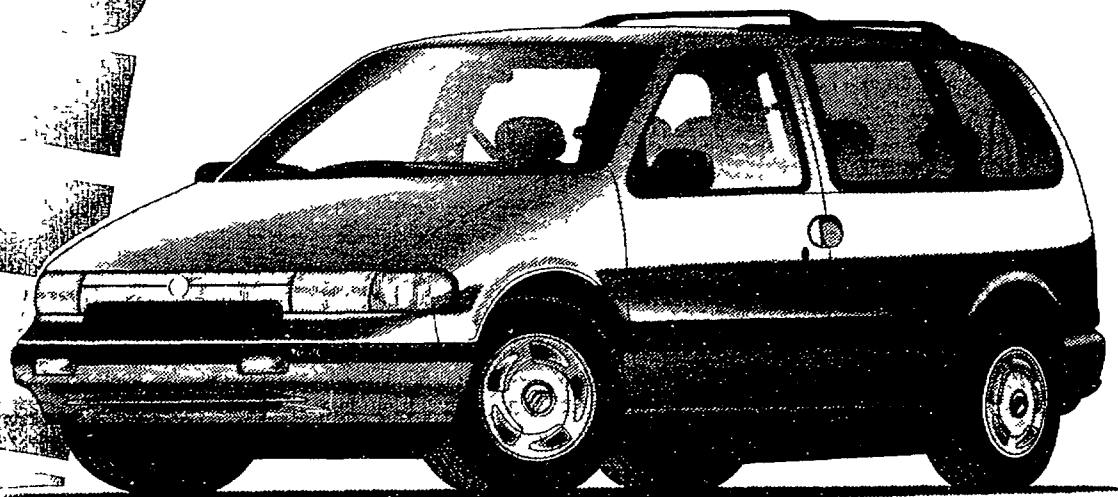

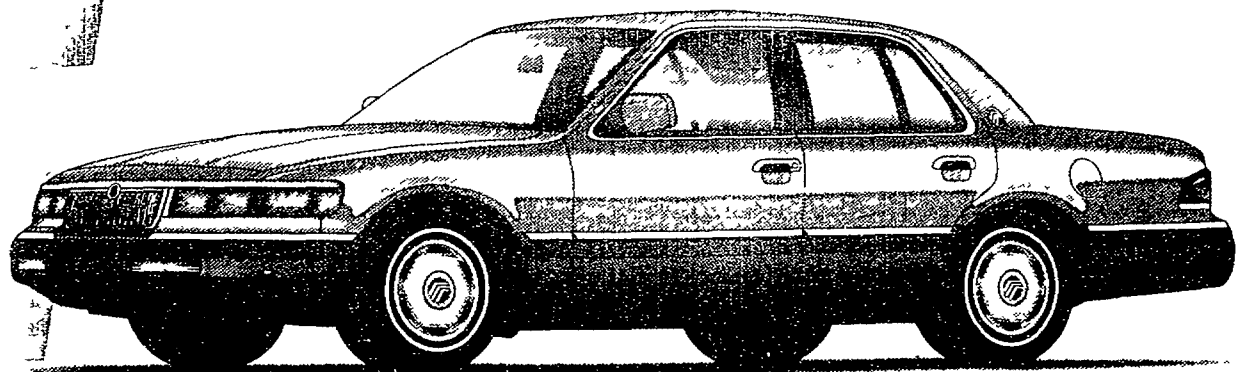

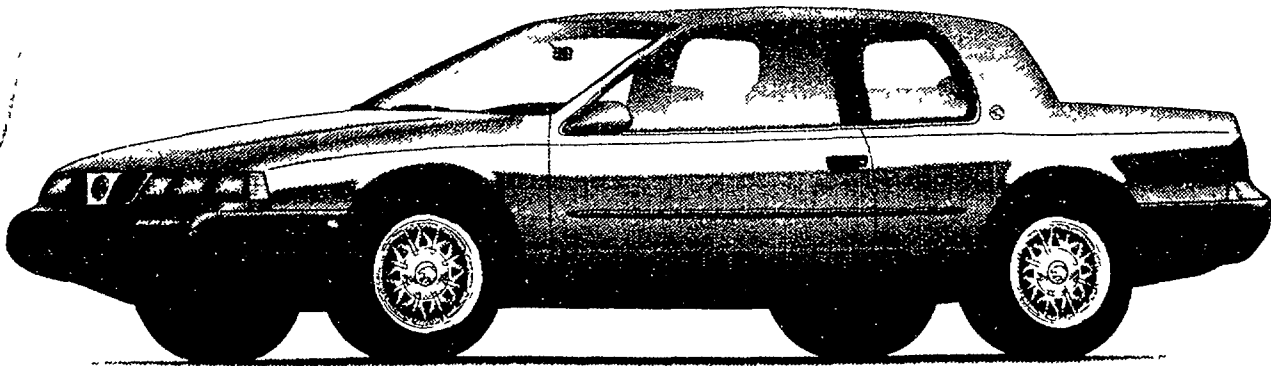

FHA mortgages may be on the rise

An increasing number of homes sales are being financed with a mortgage loan insured by the Federal Housing Administration (FHA). And if Congress passes pending legislation, the number of FHA loans will significantly increase, predicts Doug Harder, a loan officer with American Residential Mortgage Corp.

"An FHA mortgage can be the best form of financing for first-time home buyers," Harder said.

"It's flexible and can even be obtained with a low or no down payment. But the home must be in good shape to qualify for one of these loans."

In several recent cases processed by Harder, the parents of the home buyers paid the entire down payment and closing costs as a gift.

This is acceptable with an FHA loan if it is strictly a gift and given by a parent or other blood relative, he said.

In other cases, the loan note was co-signed by a parent or other relative to help qualify for the loan.

Again, this is acceptable if the cosigner personally qualifies for the needed loan. This type of flexibility is not available with a conventional loan with private mortgage insurance (PMI) coverage, he noted.

However, a home must be safe, sanitary and generally in good condition to pass the scrutinizing eye of the FHA appraiser, Harder noted. In some cases, needed repair costs can be incorporated into the FHA loan amount.

New legislation, if approved, will increase the maximum amount of FHA loan throughout the

The Birch is for the mature and festive

A gazebo-shaped nook and wide front porch give a festive and welcoming appearance to the Birch, a small home designed for a young family, single person, or an older couple with grown children. Bedrooms are clustered together, to the right, and family living spaces, both formal and informal, are to the left.

The nook, with its eight-sided vaulted ceiling, is equally striking inside. Naturally illuminated by bay windows, this room is filled with light.

large pantry adds still more storage capacity. Other amenities include a built-in dishwasher, range and oven.

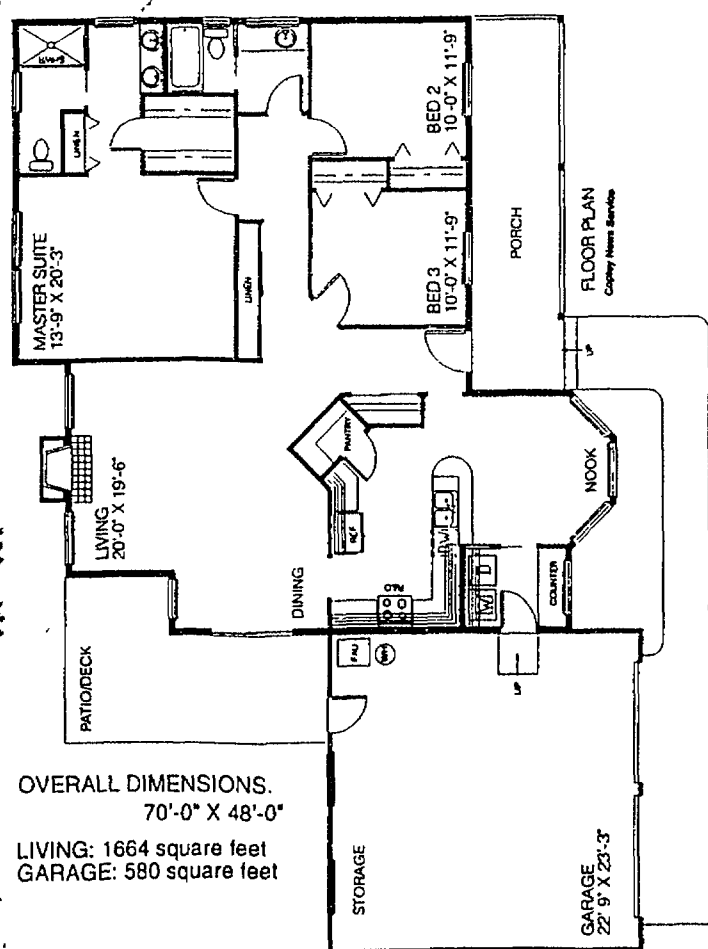

Log homes represent a lifestyle as much as an architectural style, according to local representatives for a log home manufacturer.

"It's a warm, relaxing environment, and if you don't want a lot of family over, don't build a log home," said Gordon Merritt of Pinckney, noting that his own log home draws friends and relatives like a magnet, especially during the holiday season.

Merritt and his partner, Art Black, are local representatives for Jim Barna Log Systems, headquartered in Tennessee. The pair will build log homes just about anywhere, but they especially like to work in Livingston County, which they say offers many desirable sites for log homes.

"This is a tremendous area for log homes, because it is within easy commuting distance (to nearby cities) and the property is not only affordable, but has a lot to offer with many lakes, rivers, streams and wildlife," Merritt said. "People interested in these homes are also interested in wildlife and a slower pace of life."

Livingston County has the largest population of log homes in the state, Merritt added.

"You don't see them very much because they are usually set far back from the road," he said, noting that there are seven log homes on the four-mile-long road he lives on.

There are three types of log homes, Merritt said. Rustic homes are just what they sound like, and generally are constructed for use as cottages. A middle-of-the-road version offers a country setting that can serve as a backdrop for various decorating styles, and a contemporary version goes best with modern furnishings and decor. Most people interested in building a log home choose the middle-of-the-road version, Merritt said.

All of the logs for Barna Log Homes come from the Boone and Crockett National Forest in Tennessee, where the manufacturer, Jim Barna Log Systems, donates two trees for every one taken from the forest.

Fun with flowers and children

Summer is the perfect time to enjoy the rainbow of beautiful colors in flowers.

Try putting some of those blooms to use by creating floral decorations with children. Kids enjoy making simple crafts and can also gain a greater appreciation of the environment by working with natural materials.

The following floral projects are easy and inexpensive to do, and make great gifts and ornaments for the holidays.

PRESSING FLOWERS

Pressing flowers can be as simple as using a phone book or as elaborate as making a plant press. To construct a plant press, use:

2 (12-inch-square) pieces of 1/4-inch-thick plywood.

4 (4-inch-long) bolts with wing nuts and washers.

8 (12-inch-square) pieces of corrugated cardboard, newspaper or paper towels.

First drill one 9/16th inch hole approximately 3/4 inch in from each side at each of the four corners of the two pieces of plywood. These will be the top and bottom of the press.

Next, cut off all the corners of the corrugated cardboard so the drill holes of the top and bottom of the press freely

line up when the cardboard is positioned between them.

Next, sandwich each cardboard with a few pieces of newspaper or paper towels, beginning and ending with cardboard and placing between the top and bottom of the press.

To tighten and loosen the press, place your four bolts from the top of the press, through the washer to the bottom of the press and tighten with the wing nuts.

When pressing flowers, just assemble and disassemble the press, placing plant parts between pieces of newspapers or paper towels and then gently tightening the bolts.

The papers act as blotters to help absorb water from the flowers and the eight layers give plenty of room to press lots of flowers in the same or on different days. Bring your completed press with you right into the garden.

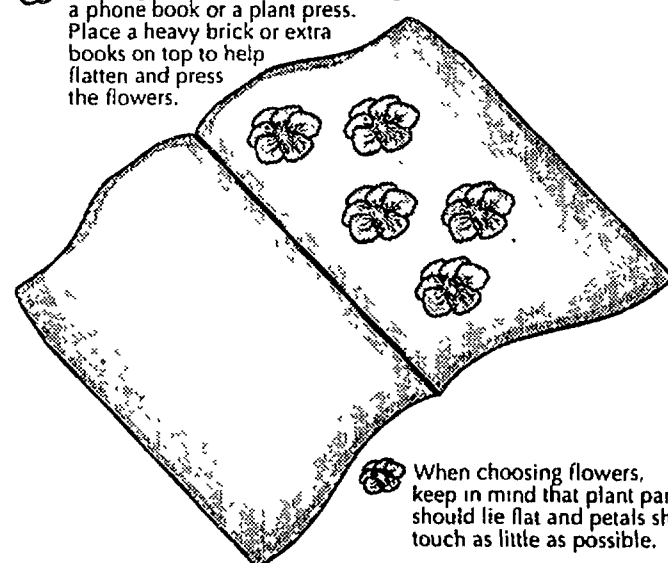
If you are using a heavy book, be sure to place a heavy brick or extra books on top to help flatten and press the flowers.

When choosing flowers to press, keep in mind that plant parts should lie flat and petals should overlap or

nation—particularly in high cost areas. It will raise the FHA base amount (loan limit in places not designated as high-cost) to an increased fixed amount and raise the maximum in high-cost areas on a basis reflecting the local residential market.

By raising the FHA base loan amount to at least \$100,000, about 1.5 million more families nationwide would be able to purchase and finance a home, according to analysts at the National Association of Realtors.

By raising the maximum FHA loan limit in high-cost areas,

another 250,000 families will be in position to buy a home, NAR estimated.

Q. Has there been a study to determine most popular residential street names?

A. A recent study determined the most common street name where California homes were sold over the past four years.

The most frequent street name where these homes were located wasn't Main Street or 1st Street. It was 3rd Street, where 1,351 of those sold homes were located, according to INPHO, a real estate information service.

Besides the numbered street

names, the most popular word names for streets reflect the particular history and characteristics of the local area. Trees, fruit-bearing and otherwise, comprise over a quarter of the name list.

The most common word name was Walnut Street. Next in line was Palm, Olive, Oak and Park—street names that are familiar in communities throughout the country.

History is well-represented in the list of most common street names, such as Mission, Foothill, Pleasant Valley, Buena Vista.

Q. What are the pros and cons of taking an equity loan?

A. I heard a soft-spoken radio announcer deliver a commercial recently. He was urging listeners to borrow money against their home—hustling equity loans for a sponsor firm.

"Of course, we will charge you a fair rate of interest for the money," he said. "But our main concern is giving you the money you need to solve immediate personal problems. And if you own a home, we feel sure you'll pay the money back and will probably tell others about our loans."

What the announcer said, though packed with puffery, was not deceptive advertising. But what he did not say is more

important.

Missing information: Precisely what is meant by "fair rate of interest." In addition to interest costs, there will be substantial closing charges, like a property appraisal. The equity loan being promoted is secured by a mortgage (or trust deed) on the borrower's home. If the loan is not repaid on schedule, the borrower could lose his home.

Q. What is a co-housing community?

A. It's a community concept, developed in Denmark about 20 years ago, where families live close

to one another and share many of the facilities. It's a new but growing trend in this country.

It's basically an alternative option to living in single-family homes, condos and apartments with elements similar to a European village or small town in the United States. Details on this development concept will be carried in an upcoming column.

touch as little as possible. Succulent materials or dense flowers are not good choices for pressing.

Petals can be removed from dense flowers and repositioned flat in the press.

Try pansies, violas, Queen Anne's lace, goldenrod, clover, salvia, lavender, cosmos and baby's breath. Look for a variety in color, shape, size and plant parts, including different leaves, grasses and even a little stem to add accent to decorations.

It's best to pick flowers and other materials late in the day so that they are com-

pletely free of dew or rainwater. Keep your press in a dry place and expect most plants to be ready for use in about two weeks.

If color has faded too much, try adding a color wash with watercolor paints, adding as little water as possible to the paint. Gently apply color to the back of the pressed flower with a paintbrush. A little experimentation will result in desirable color accents.

FLOWER ART

Once you have a supply of pressed flow-

ers, try making note paper, cards, book-marks or picture collages.

One easy way to make flower stationery is to arrange pressed flowers on the plain side of wax paper. Add color if desired by adding pieces of colored paper or tissue to your arrangement.

Cover the entire arrangement with a sheet of white facial tissue. Then dab on diluted glue (equal parts glue to water) to thoroughly moisten the tissue. Let the arrangement dry.

Iron both sides with a warm (not hot) iron. Place this under a

book for two days to flatten it. You can then glue this parchmentlike paper arrangement onto colored paper for stationery and note cards.

Another method is to arrange the pressed flowers on a piece of stiff paper that has been folded into a card. Carefully cover with clear contact paper, making sure to smooth out any air bubbles.

Bookmarks are made in the same fashion. Cut the paper narrower, punch a hole in the top and knot some yarn through

the hole to finish it off.

Finished products can not only be used as stationery, but can be applied to note-book covers, lampshades, place mats, on accessories or arranged behind picture frames.

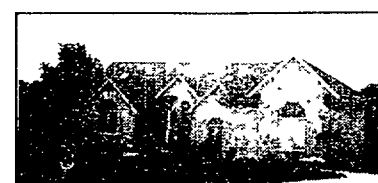

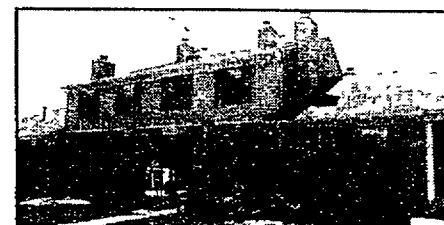

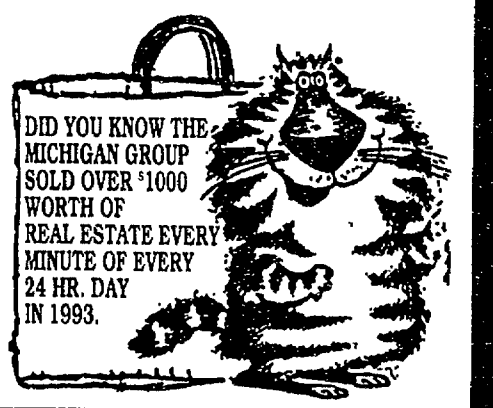

Cabinet worth thousands

This cabinet from the workshop of Gustav Stickley was made between the 1890s and 1915 and could probably sell for more than \$6,000.

Q. Enclosed is a picture of an oak china cabinet that I inherited. On the back is a paper label with the words "Gustav Stickley — Craftsman Workshop—Eastwood, New York—New York Showroom —29 West Thirty-fourth St." The label also has a joiner's compass with the words "Als ik kan."

Could you give me an idea of the value of my china cabinet?

A. Your china cabinet is an excellent example of furniture from the workshop of Gustav Stickley. He was influenced by the arts and crafts movement that developed in Europe. Stickley furniture was made from the late 1890s to 1915. The paper label you described was an early shopmark used around 1902.

The words "Als ik kan" are Finnish words that mean "As well as I can." A current price guide lists a china cabinet similar to yours at \$6,000. On the other hand, prices for well-documented Gustav Stickley cabinets, in mint condition, can range well over \$20,000.

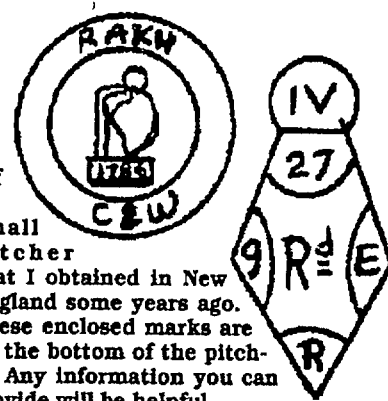
Q. My pickle castor has an ornate silver-plated footed frame, lid and tongs. The insert is made of cranberry glass and is decorated with enameled flowers. I would like to know the approximate value of my castor.

A. Pickle castors were accessories to the Victorian table settings and were used to serve pickles. They were available in colored art glass and pattern glass.

By 1900, their popularity had ebbed. Your castor would probably be worth about \$400 to \$425 in good condition.

Q. I am curious about the background

of a small pitcher that I obtained in New England some years ago. These enclosed marks are on the bottom of the pitcher. Any information you can provide will be helpful.

A. Your pitcher was made by the Staffordshire pottery Clowes & Williamson in Fenton, England. The firm was established in 1786.

The registry mark shows this piece is ceramic and it was made Aug. 27, 1881. The value of your pitcher would probably be about \$200 in good condition.

Q. We have a ceramic "Little Orphan Annie" mug from the 1930s. It is 3 inches tall and was an Ovaltine premium.

Is it worth anything?

A. Little Orphan Annie was a comic character created by Harold Gray in 1924. When she debuted on radio, Ovaltine was the sponsor.

The mug was just one of the many premiums offered by Ovaltine.

"Hakes Guide to Comic Character Collectibles" by Ted Hake lists a mug, circa 1932, similar to yours, at \$50.

Q. I have a Staffordshire figurine of a poodle that was given to my parents as a wedding gift in 1912. The height is approximately 9 inches, and he is sitting.

He is white, with "coleslaw" trim on his shoulders, ears and tail. His face is painted and the molded collar is gold. I would appreciate any information you might have on my poodle.

A. Staffordshire potters made a variety of small figures of humans and animals. Some of the most popular and appealing were figurines of dogs.

They were usually sold in pairs and widely produced. Your poodle would probably be in the \$65 to \$75 range in good condition.

The logging lifestyle can be dry, cozy, and insulating

or uninvolved as the customer wants in the construction process, short of just providing the logs.

"We don't sell just the logs without the labor to put the house up," Merritt said. "Stacking the logs is the easy part, but putting on the roof and such is much harder. All our crews are drawn from Tennessee and specialize in log homes. It takes about two weeks for them to come in and erect the home."

As with conventional, or "stick built" homes, it takes about four months to finish the interior, Merritt said.

Merritt and Black offer two basic construction packages with two

different per-square-foot costs. In a "turn key" project, the customer shows the builders the site and they take it from there, completing the home at an approximate cost of \$80 to \$85 per square foot. For about \$40 per square foot, Merritt and Black will erect the shell, providing the roof, windows and doors, but no interior walls.

"The customer can then finish the interior any way they want," Merritt said.

Log walls are excellent insulators if they are built correctly, he added. The logs are stacked and connected with tongue-and-groove connectors covered with one-half inch of insulating foam. Windows are installed on a t-shaped jamb with insulation stuffed all around them.

Barna windows, which also come from Tennessee, are not well-suited to Michigan's climate, Merritt said, so he and Black use Weatherthane windows, which are manufactured in Brighton.

The exterior of a log home can handle almost any finish, but Merritt prefers Sikkens wood finish, which is specially developed for log homes and lasts from five to seven years.

The interior can be finished like any other type of wood, Black said.

Because log homes built with "green" logs settle several inches due to moisture loss, Merritt and Black use kiln-dried logs of white or yellow pine or red cedar, which retain only about 20 percent of their moisture after the drying

process.

"The logs lose most of their moisture during the first heating season, so we recommend people not overdo it with fireplaces or wood burners that first year," Merritt said. "They shouldn't set the thermostat too high, either."

Merritt and Black also perform maintenance work on log homes.

"It's a niche we've found that no one else was handling," Merritt said. "It's offered us a tremendous insight on how other log manufacturers do homes and has been a benefit to the way we do our business."

Merritt was educated in advertising and marketing and spent about 10 years working in the advertising business. When he and his wife, Michelle, decided

they wanted to build a log home four years ago, Merritt researched manufacturers and became knowledgeable about the product. He built their home almost entirely by himself.

Black has been employed in the building field for about 15 years and formed his own company about eight years ago, specializing mainly in new homes and room additions. He and Merritt, who were high school classmates in Northville, paired up about 1 1/2 years ago in the log home business. Both are licensed contrac-

tors.

Merritt and Black will conduct a log home seminar on Saturday, Oct. 15, at Mt. Brighton, starting at 9 a.m. Cost will be \$20 per person or \$25 per couple. The seminar will cover financing, planning, design, construction and an overview of Jim Barna Log Systems. Cost of the seminar also includes a special log home package for those who attend.

Money Management

Don't let your emotions cloud your thinking when making loans to family members. Family relationships are less likely to be jeopardized if you work out the details of any loan agreements before you hand over the money to a relative.

HOW MUCH CAN YOU AFFORD?

The Michigan Association of Certified Public Accountants (MACPA) recommends that before you lend money to anyone, you should assess your current financial situation. Consider the impact a loan will have on your cash flow, outstanding debts and future financial goals.

SETTING INTEREST RATES

The next step is deciding how much interest, if any, you will charge. If you have cash in savings vehicles offering low returns, such as 3 percent, you can offer your relatives an interest rate of 6 percent and earn more money.

In establishing an interest rate on an intrafamily loan, be sure to consider the federal tax implications. Minimum interest rates are fixed monthly by the federal government according to the type and term of the loan. For a demand loan (a loan payable in full at any

time on demand of the lender) if you don't charge the applicable short-term federal rate (recently 3.92 percent), you are considered to have imputed or unstated interest and will be taxed on the difference between the federal rate and what you actually charged. Keep in mind, too, that making loans of over \$10,000 at a below-market interest rate may result in the loan being deemed a gift in the IRS's eyes.

FINANCING A HOME

If a family member asks you to help finance a down payment on a new home, you can offer to make a number of different arrangements.

For example, you can deposit the money needed to satisfy the down payment in a collateral account with the mortgage lender. With this type of arrangement, your deposit, plus interest, will be returned once the mortgage lender determines that the mortgage holder has built up sufficient equity in the home.

Depending on your financial situation, you can also consider holding the mortgage on the home yourself. Structured properly, you may be able to generate more income this way than by putting your money in other investments.

Now we've been talking country here, but there is a western component. Whose seen a western movie without bad guys? Or for that matter, with no railroads? You can get both at Novi's Country Fest in a dang unique package.

Walled Lake's Coe Railroad is ready to relieve "The Great Train Robbery."

Inside the Expo Center, Roller Concession will be unveiling its soup in a bread bowl.

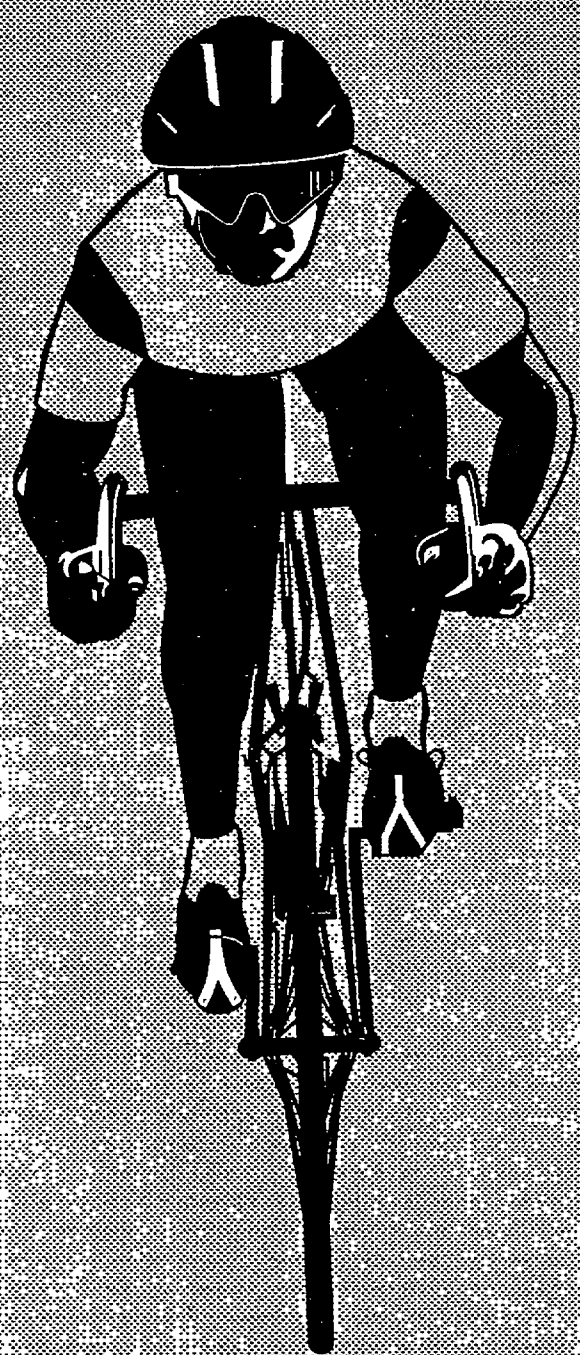
The recipe is just as the name implies, Mallett said.

"It is nice to know they chose in our first year to help us out that way and raise some money for themselves," Mallett said.

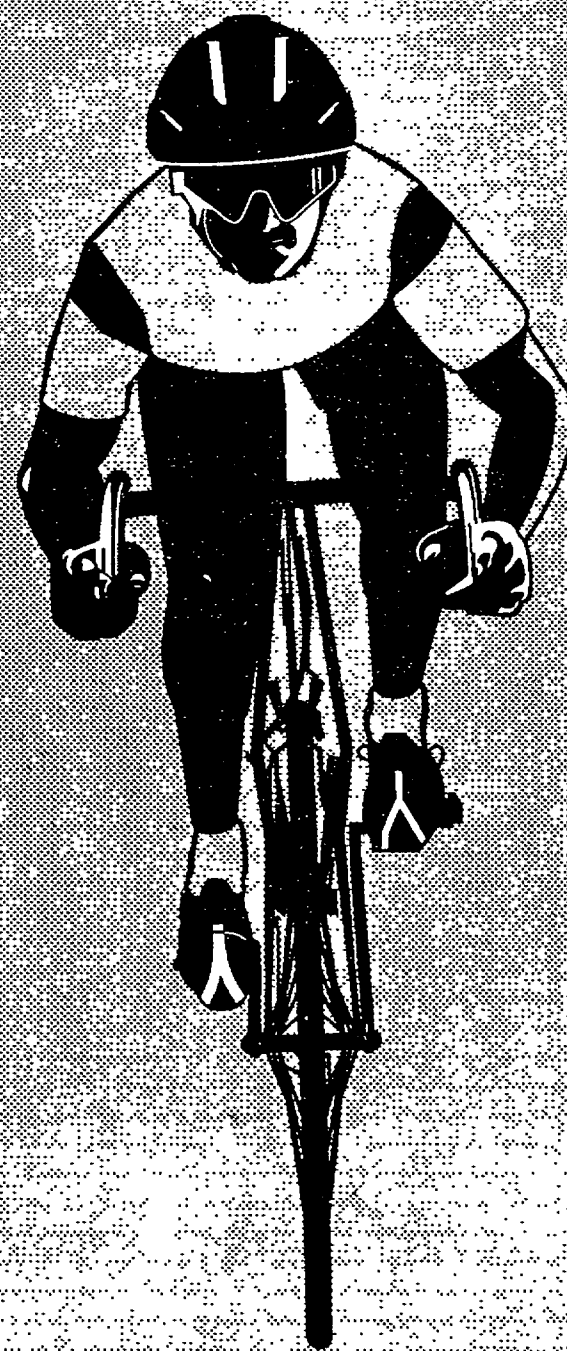

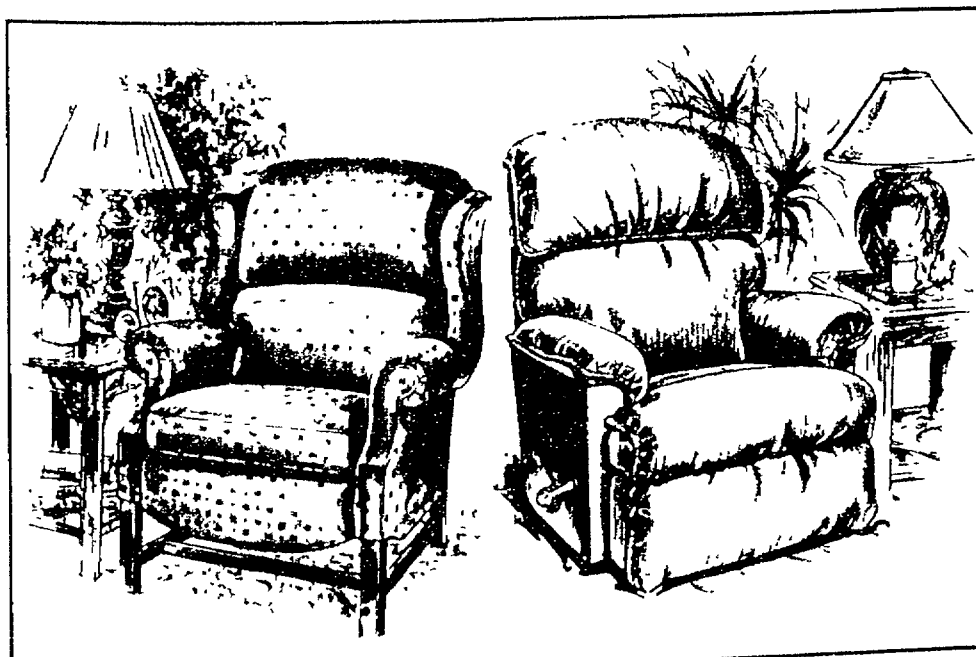

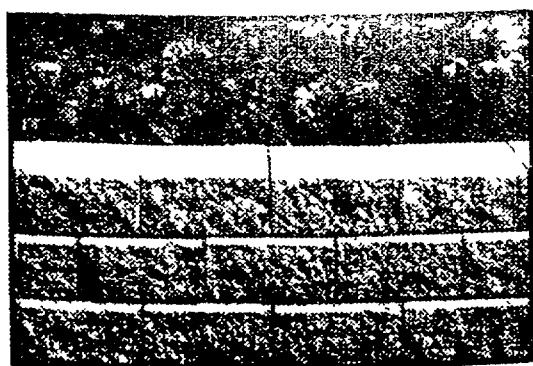
The Plymouth Theater Guild performs from 6-7 p.m., and karaoke — a top festival attraction the last two years — returns from 7-9:30 p.m.
