Essential services win big in township

The smiles came early and often on Tuesday night among supporters of Northville Township's millage requests. Proposals 1 and 2 won voter approval in landslide fashion.

The convincing victory secures funding for the township's essential services through 1998. It also caps a three-month push by

millage supporters to get Proposals 1 and 2 passed.

Here are the unofficial vote totals:
• Proposal 1: 4,905 yes (67 percent), 2,415 no (33 percent).
• Proposal 2: 4,584 yes (63 percent), 2,733 no (37 percent).
Voter turnout in the township on Nov. 8 was heavy: 55.2 percent. Some 7,786 of the township's 14,102 registered voters cast

ballots. Of them, 2,292 voted by absentee ballot - 29.4 percent of the total.

Proposal 1 asked for 3.84 mills a year for four years to fund the township's Department of Public Safety: 2.99 mills for police and 0.85 mill for fire in a single ballot request. Proposal 2 asked for 0.4 mill a year for four years to fund the township's share of services it jointly funds with the City of Northville: the Parks & Recreation Depart-

ment, Youth Assistance and the senior citizen program.

They both won large majorities on election day, taking every one of the township's 10 voting precincts and even the absentee ballots as well.

Among the 12 voting groups (the 10 precincts and two blocks of absentee vot-

Law gets back in as GOP cleans up

Northville city and township voters sent out one clear and concise message Tuesday at the voting booths. One that was also evident throughout the rest of Michigan - it is the year of the Republican.

In the local, as well as statewide races, from governor to county commissioners, Republican candidates made a clean sweep.

Northville residents' commitment to fulfilling their civic duty to vote was characterized as above average by city and township clerks, with a 56 percent voter turnout (61 percent for the city and 55 percent for the township).

Local voters stood in line with the rest of the state for the gubernatorial race with 73 percent of city voters and 77 percent of Northville Township voters saying "yes" to Gov. John Engler.

Democratic gubernatorial candidate Howard Wolpe received 22 percent of the township's vote and 26 percent from city voters.

Voters pushed Republican incumbent Robert Geake over Democrat Patrick O'Neil for a fifth term as state senator for the 9th district (70 percent for the city and 74 percent for the township).

Republican Gerald Law received 67 percent approval from city voters and 71 percent from

Outcome of library election still unclear

And the winners are ... Having both the elements of an up-in-the-air election campaign and a race where the candidates in the running are shoo-ins is a virtual impossibility.

The Northville community, however, has managed to defy the law of election physics with its District Library Board race.

It comes as no surprise that the four candidates running for the seven open seats for the new board have been elected to office.

The three remaining seats on the board, however, were open to any write-in candidates Northville voters saw fit to jot down. For those who are anxiously anticipating the write-in results to see who has merited a seat on the board, don't hold your breath.

The totals for the write-in candidates will not be calculated until tomorrow afternoon, officials at

the Wayne County Election Commission said.

Interim District Library Board Member Wendy Gutowski headed the pack of candidates with 4,414 votes from city and township voters. Candidate Bill Brown was next with 4,052 votes, Anna Sarkisian received 4,045 votes and Lynn Parklan garnered 3,951.

Assuming no write-in candidate gets more votes totals than the four candidates who appeared on the ballot, the new district board officials will serve four-year terms.

The remaining three candidates will serve two-year terms once the board becomes effective Jan. 1.

Top vote-getter Wendy Gutowski said she is pleased and excited to serve on the board. Her win, however, was a little anti-climatic in the foregone conclusion of a race.

"I am glad to be on the path to continue the work of getting a dis-

Dems holds Ford's old seat; Knollenberg wins 2nd term

Although America will see a Republican Congress for the next two years, John Schall won't be a part of it. Joe Knollenberg will be, however.

Schall, the GOP candidate in the race for Michigan's 13th U.S. House of Representatives seat, lost to Democratic State Rep. Lynn Rivers in a contest that went down to the wire Tuesday. The 13th District includes Northville Township and the Wayne County portion of Northville City. It stretches as far west and Ann Arbor and as far

east as Inkster.

Both major parties waged an aggressive campaign for the seat after Congressional powerhouse Rep. Bill Ford announced his retirement.

In Michigan's heavily Republican 11th District - which includes the Oakland County portion of Northville City - first-term incumbent GOP Rep. Joe Knollenberg cruised to victory over Democratic challenger Mike Breshgold of Farmington Hills.

As expected, Northville voters leaned heavily towards Schall and Knollenberg on Tuesday. Here are the unofficial vote totals:

Northville Township:

• Rivers: received 2,110 votes, 28.6 percent of the total cast.

• Schall: received 5,103 votes, 69.2 percent of the total.

• The three other candidates in the race collected about 2.25 percent of the vote.

Northville City/Wayne County:

• Rivers: received 423 votes, about 35 percent of the total cast.

• Schall: received 741 votes, about 62 percent of the total.

The three other candidates picked up about 2.5 percent of the vote.

Laphams close a chapter Longtime clothiers to go out of business

Lapham's.

The name of the downtown Northville men's clothing and tailoring shop has been synonymous with Main Street for generations.

By the end of the month, however, much to the dismay of many devoted customers, Chuck and Maxine Lapham will be closing up the downtown mainstay for good.

"Last week I had a woman come into the store, take me in her arms and start crying because she found out we were going out of business," said Maxine, who has run the store with her husband, Chuck, for the past 41 years.

The history of the couple's clothing store, which

has provided local and out-of-town customers personalized service for years, runs deeper than the four decades the Laphams have run it.

Chuck Lapham's grandfather, Charles A. Ponsford, first opened the store at 120 E. Main in 1910 as a women's shop selling hats, buttons and sewing materials. Later, Lapham's mother, Mary Elizabeth (Ponsford) Lapham, took the store over and changed it to the Northville Men's Shop.

When Lapham's mother asked him to take over the management of the store in 1953, Chuck, who was born in Northville and has lived here his whole life, was driving a gravel truck for the J.J. Zaytt Trucking Co. and had no thoughts of running a clothing store.

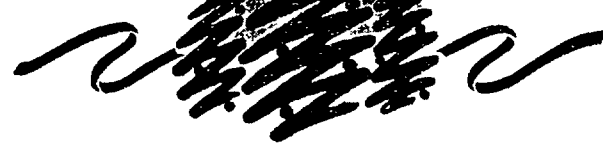

Woman, 50, found dead in her home

virtual cesspool of filth, with numerous decaying cat carcasses and piles of animal feces littered throughout the home.

"This is the worst I've ever seen," said Officer Glenn Stewart at the scene, shaking his head in disbelief.

Sandra Myers, 50, of 901 Carrington, was found dead at the home and her son, Stephen Myers, 25, was transported to Botsford Hospital in Farmington Hills. He was later transferred to Henry Ford Hospital in Detroit where he was treated for carbon monoxide poisoning.

He was reportedly talking to visitors on Tuesday and was expected to survive.

City police classified the woman's death as accidental, the result of a gas leak from the water heater in the home's basement. Police confirmed that large amounts of carbon monoxide had been found in the woman's body. Consumers' Power Co. was also at the scene Tuesday to determine the cause of the leak.

It is uncertain how long the woman and her son had been in the house, Captain James Petres said. Neighbors, however, reported seeing Sandra Myers outside in the past couple of days.

Police officers and firefighters wore rubber boots as they surveyed the scene and used masks

to shield themselves from the stench as they moved in and out of the home.

Twelve cats were found dead inside the house. Several had already started to decay, indicating they had died some time before the gas leak occurred. Twelve more cats were found still alive.

Cat feces were discovered throughout the rooms of the house, with a pile so high in one area police had to shovel it away in order to open one of the doors.

Several neighbors of the Myers, who said the woman had lived at the address for at least the past 20 years, claimed the stench from the home was often detectable from the sidewalk.

Mark Schilling, the neighborhood's postal carrier, said the odor from the house was often unbearable.

"I had to hold my breath every day when I put the mail in her box because the smell was so bad," he said.

The Northville City Building Department has condemned the house and the Michigan Anti-Cruelty Society removed the surviving cats.

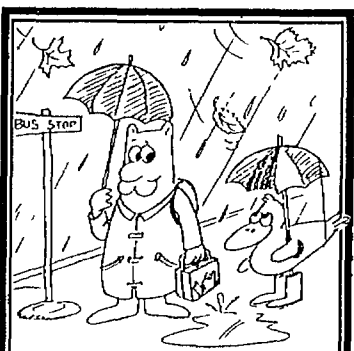
Fire Chief Jim Allen said the home would have been condemned had the city been aware of its condition.

"How can people live like that?" he said.

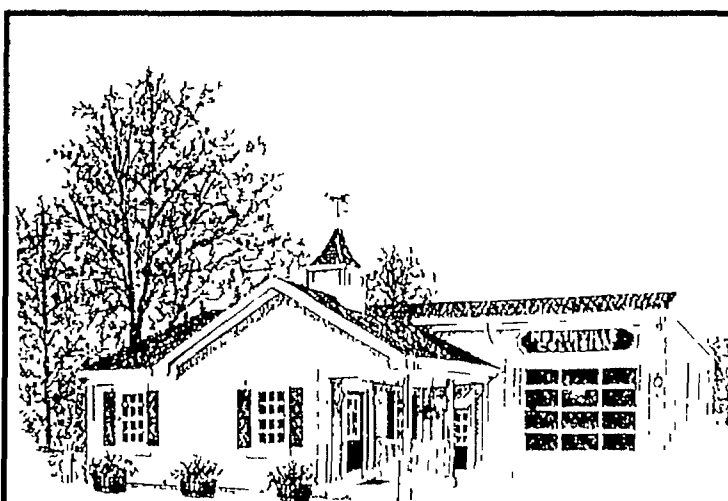

Police News

Police look for suspect in church burglary

The Northville City Police Department is investigating an Oct. 24 break-in at the First Presbyterian Church, 200 E. Main St., after some \$400 in stereo and television equipment was stolen from the church's administrative offices.

Several offices in the church were discovered ransacked after a church employee came into work.

Upon closer inspection, church staff reported one VCR, a compact disc player, a color television and two stereo speakers missing.

Several doors and locks to various offices had been damaged and the contents of the offices were in disarray.

A vending machine selling Coca Cola products appeared to be broken into with a hammer, but an attempt to access the change compartment was unsuccessful.

Police believe the suspect(s) may have gained access into the building via a window inside the church's courtyard. One of the courtyard windows on the far north side was found slightly open with a potted plant below it.

The case remains open.

OUIL: Township police arrested a 423-year-old Livonia man for operating a vehicle while under the influence of liquor (OUIL) on Saturday.

The arresting officer said that he saw the man's 1992 Ford Probe swerve from one side of the road to the other as it tried to pass his patrol unit at about 2:10 that morning. The man admitted to drinking "a couple beers" at the

Wagon Wheel that evening. He failed field sobriety tests. Breathalyzer testing at police headquarters later showed him to have a blood alcohol level of 0.28 percent, nearly three times the legal limit.

The man is currently under court order to drive only to work and to an alcohol treatment program. He was cited as well for violating the order and faces a hearing later this month in 35th District Court.

OUIL II: Township police arrested a 32-year-old Livonia man for OUIL on Nov. 3.

The reporting officer in the case said that he saw the man's 1987 Chevrolet pickup driving erratically as it tried to pass his patrol unit on Six Mile. The incident happened at about 2 a.m. The man, the officer added, swerved as he tried to pass, crossing the center line of the road.

The pickup was stopped and the man failed field sobriety tests. Breathalyzer testing at police headquarters later showed him to have a blood alcohol level of 0.21 percent, twice the legal limit. He faces a hearing this month in 35th District Court.

BREAK-IN: Unknown persons broke into the township's Fire Station No. 3 on Nov. 1, stealing a \$50 stepladder and causing \$20 in damages.

Police say the thieves smashed a window to get into the station. They have no leads at this time.

BREAKING AND ENTERING: Northville City Police are investi-

gating the theft of several cases of empty beer bottles at Genitti's Hole-in-the-Wall restaurant, 108 E. Main St., which may also be connected to another break-in at the Masonic Temple, located above the restaurant.

The empty cases of bottles had been stacked Oct. 24 and employees noticed them missing three days later.

The owner of the Liquor Shoppe, located across the street from Genitti's, reported to police that three teenagers, appearing to be about 15- or 16-years-old, had come in to his shop with several bags of bottles and two cases. Some of the bottles bore special Halloween labels that were not for retail sale but only for bar and restaurant use. The bottles, the owner noted, were also all from the same distributor - also the distributor the restaurant uses.

When the Liquor Shoppe owner asked the boys where they had gotten the bottles, they told him they had taken them from their garages, the owner told police.

Other than the bottles, nothing else in the store appeared to be disturbed.

The Masonic Temple, located at 106 E. Main St., also suffered a break-in during the same time the bottles were stolen from Genitti's. There were no signs of forced entry, but the rear doorway of the temple, which leads to Genitti's kitchen, was left ajar.

A former high grand priest of the temple reported to police that when he left the building the night before, the door at the top of the

stairs had been closed, but when he returned the next morning, it was open.

Most of the rooms in the temple had been ransacked, with several cabinets, closets and desk drawers left open, although the high priest said he was not sure if anything was stolen.

City police photographed the rooms and dusted the building for fingerprints.

The case remains open.

BURGLARY: Someone stole a \$200 coffee table from the clubhouse at Innsbrook Apartments on Sunday. Police found pry marks on a door in the building. They believe the thieves gained entry there, causing \$100 in damages.

PARAPHERNALIA: Township police arrested a 21-year-old Allen Park man for possession of drug paraphernalia one week ago.

A township officer said he saw the man and his 19-year-old Southgate friend trying to sneak onto the grounds of the Wayne County Child Development Center the morning of Nov. 3. While searching the man, the officer continued, he found a pipe of the kind used to smoke marijuana in his shirt pocket.

He was taken to police headquarters, processed, then released. He faces a hearing later this month in 35th District Court.

OUIL III: Township police arrested a 37-year-old Westland man for drunken driving on Nov. 6.

The reporting officer said that he

saw the man driving erratically in his 1989 Ford Thunderbird while westbound on Seven Mile at about 3 a.m. The car straddled the dotted white line separating the two westbound lanes, the officer said, and was swerving as well.

The man said he had consumed "a couple of drinks" at the Wagon Wheel that evening. He failed field sobriety tests. Breathalyzer testing at police headquarters later showed him to have a blood alcohol level of 0.13 percent, over the legal limit.

The man faces a hearing later this month in 35th District Court.

MORE OUIL: A 27-year-old South Lyon man was arrested for drunken driving in Northville Township one week ago.

Police said the man's 1991 GMC Sierra pickup ran a red light at Beck and Five Mile at about 11 p.m. on Nov. 3. A township officer saw it and pulled him over. He smelled a strong odor of intoxicants coming from the man, the officer said, and a number of other signs of intoxication. He admitted to drinking four beers that evening.

He faces a hearing later this month in 35th District Court.

Armed robbers sought

Northville Township police are investigating an alleged armed robbery which occurred at the Meijer gas station last week.

Township detectives are reviewing the case. The teenager with the gun was reported to have short blond hair and a thin build. He wore a gray sweatshirt during the offense.

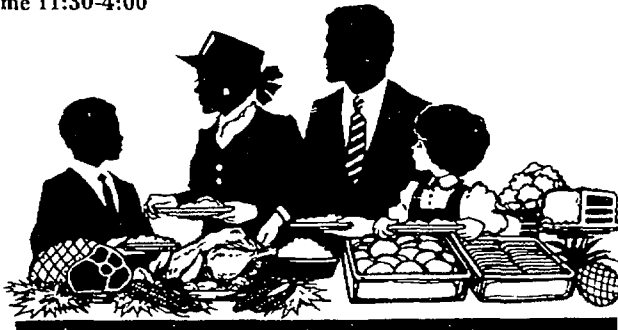

The woman who allegedly was responsible for scamming several downtown Northville business owners out of more than \$1,000 in merchandise was arrested by the Tecumseh Police Department early last week and charged with passing some 93 bad checks in Michigan and Ohio.

The Dearborn Heights woman, whose shopping spree hit downtown Northville in early October, pleaded guilty Oct. 31 in 39th Circuit Court in Adrian to several

counts of passing closed-account checks and two counts of obtaining property under false pretenses. Both offenses are felonies carrying up to 10 years in prison.

The woman allegedly wrote checks for about \$400 at the Kitchen Witch, 134 E. Main St.; \$200 at Morrison's Antiques, 105 E. Main St.; \$420 at Preferences, 103 E. Main; and about \$500 at Long's Bath Boutique, 190 E. Main.

The woman used nine different aliases with several different driver's licenses and social security

cards to back up the information on her checks.

Sergeant John Clark of the Tecumseh Police Department said the woman passed about \$15,000-\$20,000 in faulty checks in Wayne, Washtenaw, Lenexa and Hillsdale counties as well as in the Akron, Ohio, area in about the last month-and-a-half.

Once the woman was taken into custody, her son agreed to open her home to retrieve much of the merchandise.

Nelda Morrison of Morrison's Antiques said the Northville stores were able to retrieve a vast majority of their merchandise, of which some was already wrapped as

"We're glad we got our stuff back," Morrison said. "It goes to show that things get done when you stick together."

The possibility of prosecuting the woman for the checks passed in Wayne County, including Northville, remains open.

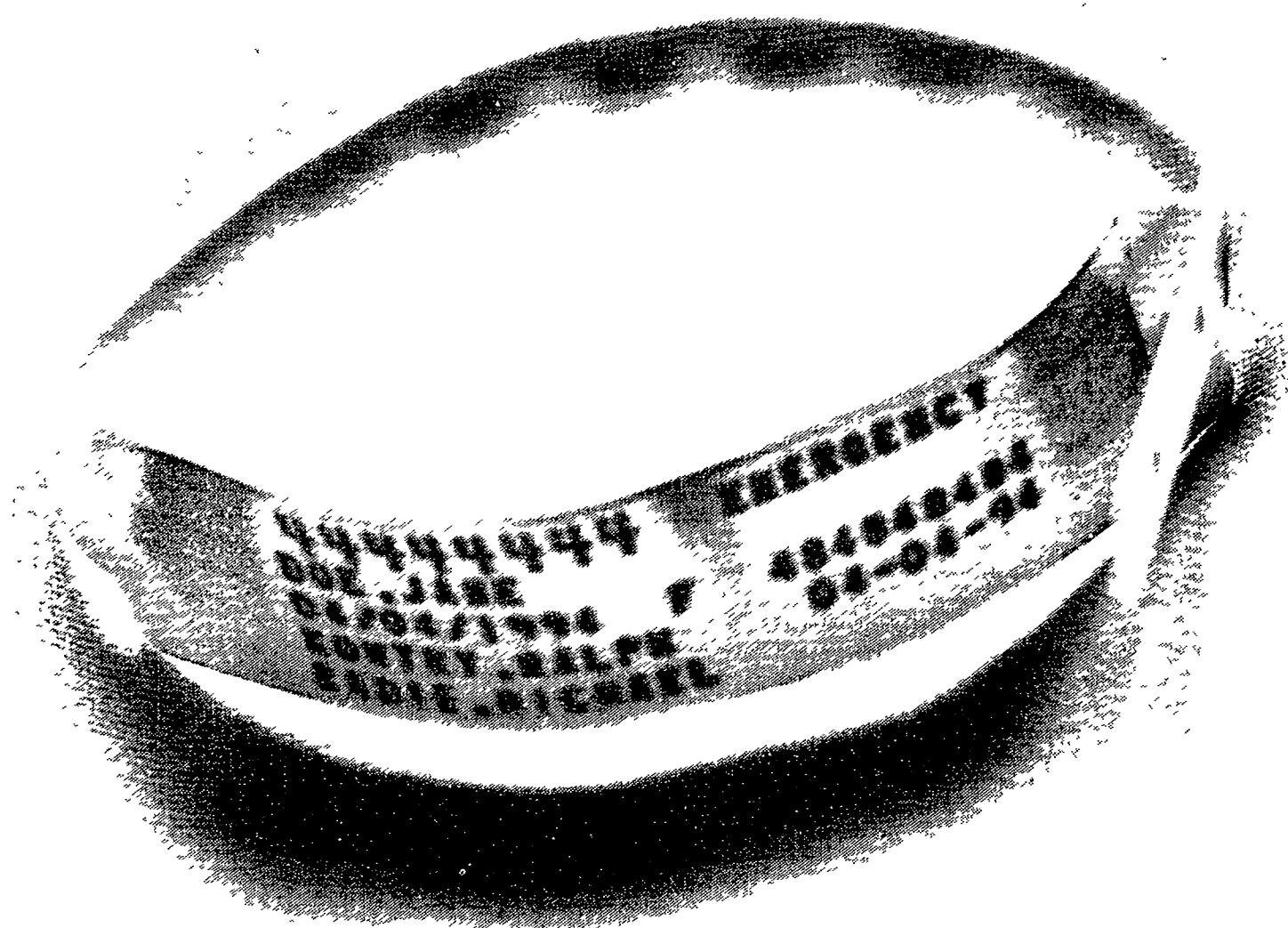

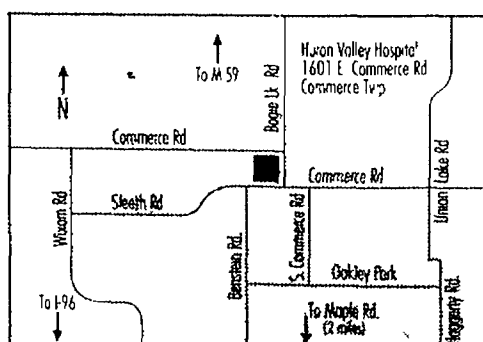

ers), the lowest "yes" vote for Proposal 1 was in precinct 1, the northwest section of the township, with 60 percent. The lowest for Proposal 2 was among the first block of absentee voters (57 percent).

The highest margins of victory were in precinct 5, which is the Kings Mill subdivision off of Northville Road between Six and Seven Mile. Proposal 1 received an 83 percent margin, Proposal 2 85 percent.

Township officials said they were very pleased.

"I'm excited," Supervisor Karen Baja said. "I'm very grateful to the people of Northville Township for their support of essential services."

"This is a much better feeling than August," she added with a

laugh.

Most people who kept the watch on Nov. 8 at Township Hall would agree. Officials began to breathe easy by 8:30 p.m., when the first wave of absentee vote totals came in, the numbers strongly favoring Proposals 1 and 2 — a very optimistic sign. The feel-good mood increased throughout the night as precinct after precinct reported in.

"I'm ecstatic," Clerk Sue Hillebrand said as the final ballots were counted. "I think this was a vote of confidence in the employees who give so much to this community."

Asked if they had expected such a large margin of support for the two proposals, both Hillebrand and Baja said they did not. Hillebrand said she had, in fact, been worried that one or both proposals

might be defeated.

"I'm pleasantly surprised," she said.

The reason for the success? A hard 90-day push on getting the word out about the two proposals.

After these same two proposals — then called A and B — were narrowly defeated at the polls on Aug. 2, their supporters have waged a voter "education" campaign to win support for them. It's been three months of doing the hundred little things that win a campaign: phone calls, talks with homeowners' associations, mailing flyers.

With the passage of the two proposals, township voters will see a slight tax increase beginning in 1995: 0.29 mill, to be precise. To the owner of a \$150,000 home, that adds up to about \$21 more a year.

• Knollenberg: received 1,194 votes, about 77.2 percent of the total vote.

• Breshgold: received 362 votes, about 22.8 percent of the total.

"I am very, very happy."

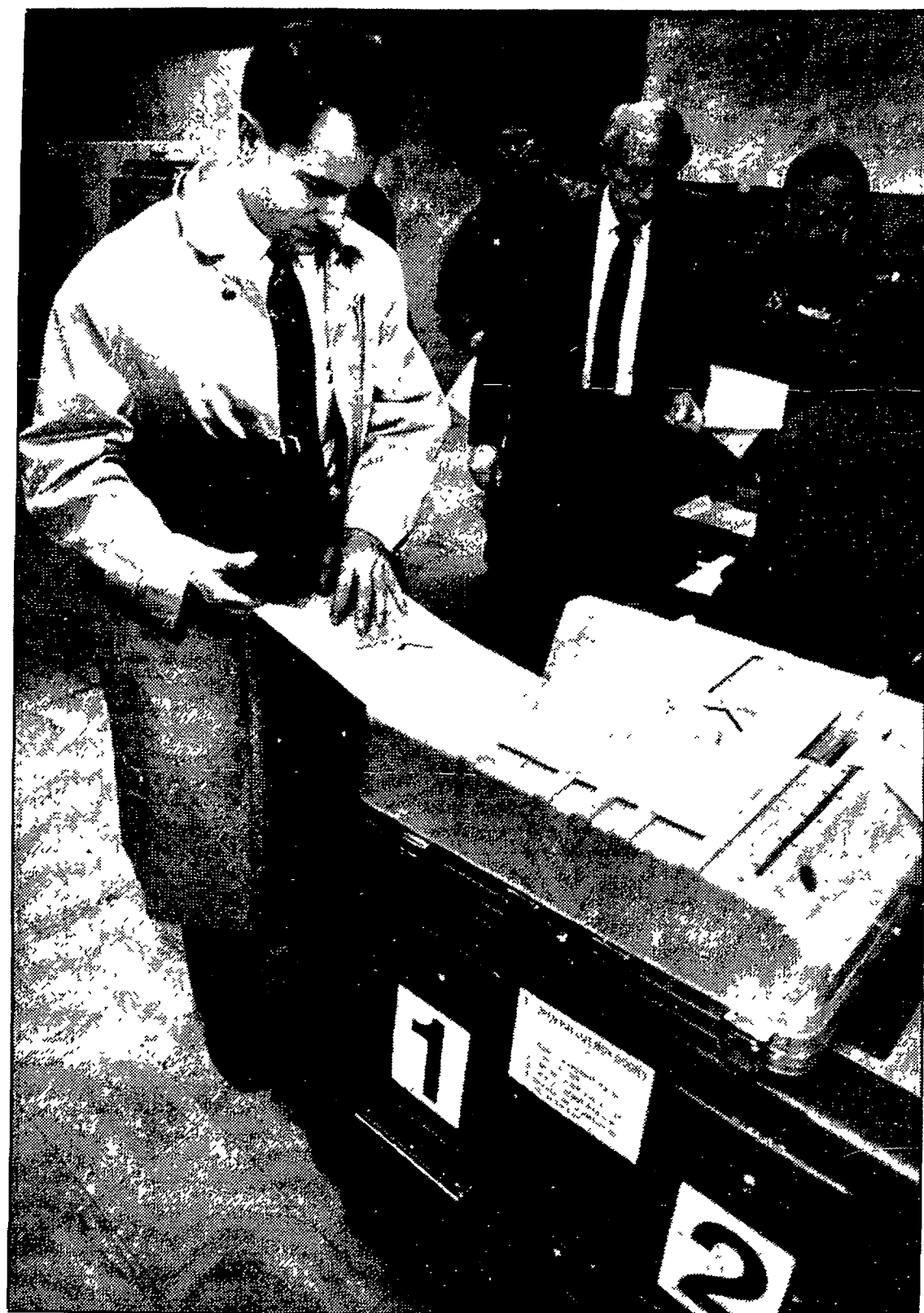

Voters approve two proposals, reject two others

Michigan voters said no to auto insurance reform and a Constitutional Convention but approved limits on inmates' appeal rights and a funding plan for state parks.

Proposal C, a law to cut auto insurance costs and premiums, was rejected, after a brutal advertising campaign between insurers and business groups (for) and the Michigan Trial Lawyers Association (against).

Proposal C's support gradually slipped as trial lawyers' ads hammered home the message that "No means No" — a reference to 1992's Proposal D, also defeated by voters.

Trial Lawyers petitioned for a referendum after Republicans in the Legislature, with help from a dozen or so Democrats, passed Public Act 143 of 1993 to cut insurance premiums 16 percent in return for limits on personal injury benefits, fees to health care

providers and rights of at-fault drivers to sue.

Even with their gains in the Legislature, Republicans are in no better position to pass a similar law in 1995-96 because of the risk the Trial Lawyers again will petition to place it on the ballot.

It was the second straight ballot victory for Trial Lawyers, who opposed the 1992 Proposal D, placed before voters by a petition drive sponsored by AAA Michigan.

Proposal A, the every-16-years call for a state Constitutional Convention, never had strong public support and was turned down.

The next chance voters will have to rewrite the state's basic legal document will be in 2010. The current constitution was adopted in 1963.

If it had been approved, voters within six months would have been asked to elect delegates from their legislative districts. The Con-

Con could then offer voters a totally rewritten constitution or a series of amendments.

Proposal B will amend the constitution to limit the right of convicts who plead guilty (or no contest) to appeal their convictions or sentences to the state Court of Appeals.

It's expected to reduce the Court of Appeals' caseload by 25 percent, according to legislative backers who put it on the ballot. State court officials have been asking for dozens more appellate judges because of the current caseload.

Critics said it was dangerous to tamper with essential rights. They also argued that fewer defendants would plead guilty and that more trials would result. But opponents never mounted a campaign against Proposal B.

Proposal P, for "parks," was the most popular with voters, winning widespread support. Former Gov.

William G. Milliken was honorary chair of the movement sparked by the Michigan United Conservation Clubs.

Proposal P will amend the constitution's financial article to establish a "Michigan State Parks Endowment Fund" to be fed by expanding the existing Natural Resources Trust Fund, funded by revenues from oil and gas leases of state lands. The parks endowment can be used to operate and maintain Michigan's 75-year-old state park system but not for land acquisition.

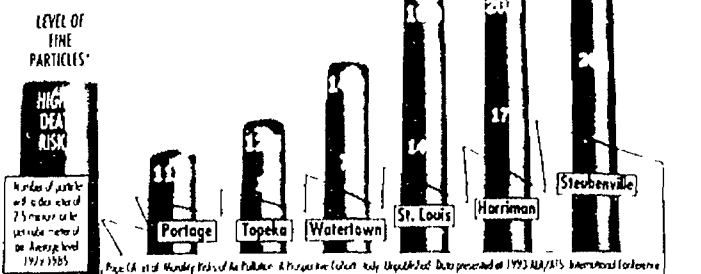
The endowment fund is expected, in time, to provide enough guaranteed support for state parks that the Department of Natural Resources won't need to lobby the Legislature for its operating budget. State funding of the parks fell from 80 percent of their budget to 20 percent since 1982 as Lansing put more money into welfare, schools and prisons.

Ice arena controversy centers on developer

Just where does the line between private citizen and public official lie?

That was the question debated at the last meeting of Northville Township Board of Trustees, one aimed mainly at Treasurer Rick Engelland.

At issue is township resident John Hamilton's proposal for a privately owned, privately financed \$8.5 million multi-use sports arena on land he owns off of Beck Road between Five and Six Mile.

Hamilton went public with the plan last month. Since then, some residents - and even some township officials - have voiced concerns about the way it's been handled. They're asking if Engelland - and possibly Supervisor Karen Baja and Clerk Sue Hillebrand - are trying to get special treatment for the plan because they personally support it.

Shirley Klokkenka, a member of the township planning commission, raised the question at the board's last meeting, held Oct. 27. The way the plan's been handled has given her pause, Klokkenka indicated.

Baja, Hillebrand and Engelland said they've held two private meetings with Hamilton. His proposal was kept confidential at Hamilton's request and as a courtesy to him. In October, the planning commission held two back-to-back sub-quorum meetings on Oct. 17 to hear a pre-

sentation from Hamilton.

On Oct. 25, the commission was presented with a proposed revision of a township ordinance covering special land use permits for commercial recreation establishments like the proposed arena. Planning officials say the change is part of an across-the-board revamp of zoning ordinance, not something tailored to Hamilton's idea.

Klokkenka at the meeting expressed concerns over the situation. At the board's Oct. 27 meeting, she said those were heightened by a recent letter Engelland wrote supporting the arena plan. Its tone bothered her, she said, giving the impression that the entire board would be ready to approve the plan.

"My grave concern is that it's as if it's already happened," Klokkenka said. "It associated you."

Engelland and other members of the board steadfastly maintain that Hamilton hasn't gotten any special treatment. He's been treated like any other developer who

comes to the township with a proposal would, they said.

"That letter was written by Rick Engelland, private citizen," Engelland said in response to Klokkenka, later saying that "it's a free country, last I heard."

While saying that, however, did express strong support for the Hamilton plan.

"This town has nothing, nothing going for it," Engelland said, speaking of recreational opportunities. "There's nothing to do. This would be a fabulous amenity."

Hamilton first approached members of the board about the plan this summer. The private meetings aren't unusual, officials said. It's routine for a developer to meet with top officials, as officials get an idea of the proposal and the developer learns what's involved in the township approval process.

"We're not telling you your project will or won't fly," Baja said. "We never say, 'Bring it on. Mr. Hamilton, we'll do all we can to get it done for you.'"

"Because Mr. Engelland supports this

does not mean that this plan will receive favorable treatment," Trustee Mark Abbo said in an emphatic tone of voice.

"A private citizen with private dollars on private land," Hillebrand said. "I can't imagine the community wouldn't embrace it."

She wouldn't support the plan, however, if it had serious problems, Hillebrand added.

The letter Klokkenka referred to is dated Oct. 22. Engelland sent it to ice skating enthusiasts in the township. In it he details Hamilton's proposal. He also discusses the fact that Hamilton will be seeking a special land use permit for the arena, a liquor license for a restaurant inside and a 12-year tax abatement.

Engelland in the letter strongly supported the plan and asked its recipients to rally support for it among township officials.

"I need your help to 'sing the praises' of this project throughout the community," the letter says. "There will be a few naysayers who will want to kill this project for their own self-serving goals. But they can be overcome! We need an all-out push to assure the township planning commission and trustees that this will be a fabulous community amenity and should be welcomed with open arms. We have never been so close!"

Engelland first mentioned the plan in a

July 10 letter to skating enthusiasts. In it, he describes the outlines of the plan, but says the developer has asked to remain anonymous for the moment.

In the first paragraph, he stated that "the township executive committee has fully endorsed this proposal."

If the plan for a private ice arena does not materialize, Engelland proposed a back-up plan: build it on land the township could get from Wayne County somewhere near the Beck/Five Mile/Sheldon area.

The township would then build the arena by selling revenue bonds, he continued asking voter approval in a November ballot question.

It was Engelland who last year proposed building a \$5 million two-rink ice arena on land the township owns off of Seven Mile near the Michigan State Police post. The money for construction would come from the sale of revenue bonds. The township would own the arena and hire a private management company to run it.

"However, this proposal got bogged down in politics," he said in the letter.

Yet another alternative, Engelland said, would be for the township to finance the arena with general obligation tax bonds. Those bonds could carry a lower interest rate, he said, saving up to \$125,000 a year.

County officials look at big parcel

What's going to happen with the 800-odd acres of land Wayne County owns in Northville Township?

That's the question a new subcommittee of the Wayne County Commission is going to answer - although it's going to take quite a while.

Preliminary indications are that the county would prefer to sell the parcel as a block to someone who's able to develop it along county guidelines. Commissioner Thaddeus McCotter, R-Livonia, said.

"Everyone's desire seems to be to sell it in one piece," McCotter said. "We're moving forward, but we want all our options open."

McCotter, whose district includes Northville, chairs the new subcommittee. While it's supposed to examine ways to sell all surplus county land, the group will focus on the so-called "Huntington Falls" property, located between Beck, Sheldon, Five and Six Mile Roads.

That was the name given to a \$1 billion industrial/residential/commercial project a group of businessmen headed by Plymouth developer Robert DeMatta proposed in 1991. Their \$31.75 million offer for the county land fell through, however, as did another purchase attempt earlier this summer.

That led the county commission to form the subcommittee. They're looking for something that's very hard to find, as evidenced by the two unsuccessful bids: someone with the financial resources to buy the land in a block and develop it for the market. County officials have talked about a multi-faceted development on the site, something including residential, industrial and commercial development, along with a golf course.

That's one of three options the county faces. The second is to keep ownership of the land and hire a management company to

develop it. The third is to break the parcel up into smaller, more easily saleable pieces.

Optical Imaging Systems (OIS) of Troy, owned by Detroit Pistons owner Bill Davidson, bought 30 acres of the land last year. OIS next week will open its headquarters/manufacturing plant there and begin building high-tech flat-panel computer screens for the aviation industry. The company has also said it's in the brainstorming stage of building a second, consumer electronics plant next door in the future.

Members of the subcommittee met last month with staff members of the county's Jobs and Economic Development department to discuss the three alternatives. McCotter said that everyone - including him - seemed to agree that the single-block sale was the best route.

"My number one goal is to get that property sold," he said.

The group will get down to work after the crush of election week ends, McCotter said. They hope to work on two issues simultaneously: fleshing out a bidding process for the land while developing a clean-up plan for it.

"There is a sense of urgency here," he said.

The land hosts some \$4 million worth of abandoned buildings and 18 underground storage tanks, McCotter said, items that will have to be taken care of before a deal for the property can be made. The cleanup could take two years and is expected to be very expensive. The county's spending \$350,000 just to determine the scope of the project.

Township officials will be involved in all dealings with the land, he added.

"Their input will be really necessary for this whole process," McCotter said, "to make sure that what's being done works with them."

Quick response wins fan

Northville Township's firefighters have some big fans in Janice and Cass Stawartz.

They own U Take The Cake, located on Five Mile near Marilyn Road. They reopened their cake specialty store last month, after a July fire shut them down for more than 10 weeks.

It would have been even longer, the cake-makers say, if not for the five-star job the fire department did during and after the blaze.

"The did a good job," Cass said. "They really kept the damage to a minimum. The worst damage we had was from the smoke, but, hey, that's not their fault."

"They really showed that they cared," Janice said. "They even followed up the next day to call and check up on me, to make sure everything was OK."

An overhead projector used for tracing designs onto cakes developed an electrical short on the evening of July 24. It sparked the fire, which spread slowly.

"It was smoldering for hours," Janice said. "They kept smelling smoke at Primo's (Pizza) next door all evening, but they weren't sure where it was coming from."

Firefighters responded to the scene, keeping the blaze contained and taking care to do the least

amount of damage possible.

"They didn't break down the door to get in," Cass said. "They let me unlock it. They saved a lot of cake pans, too - a lot of equipment."

"I tell 'em, 'Treat it like it was your own,'" Fire Chief Bill Zhmendak said of his firefighters.

The heat caused a confectionery explosion. Containers of caramel spewed everywhere. Cans of fruit popped off, splattering against the walls.

"It was a sweet fire," Zhmendak joked.

"Yeah, but talk about your messy cleanups," Janice replied.

The morning after, Zhmendak kept in contact with the Stawartzs.

"We try to help deal with the nightmare that cleaning up from a fire can be," he said.

"You're in shock, you don't know what to do," Janice said. "He called, he helped us out. He even gave us a manual that told us all of the things we'd need to handle."

The manual is something Zhmendak's come up with to help fire victims. It offers advice about the cleanup job, insurance matters and so on.

"We want the fire department to be really user-friendly," Zhmendak said.

So far, the Stawartzs say things are getting back to normal. Their shop is redone and they say they're ready to keep on making designer cakes for any and all occasions.

Laphams reflect on years of service

"I was scared to death," he said with a wide-eyed grin. "I didn't know a thing about it."

The first couple of years of running the store didn't always go smoothly, Chuck admits, as he and Maxine lived above the store in an apartment with their newborn daughter.

Since then, Lapham's has grown into a prospering business, with personalized, friendly service the key to store's success, Chuck said.

Currently, the business remains a family affair with Maxine overseeing the store's five tailors, daughter Terry Bueter acting as bookkeeper for the store and son-in-law John Bueter serving as one of the store's managers.

As a gesture to honor his customers, Lapham will be holding what he calls a "silent sale" from

now until Nov. 21 to provide patrons with the same service they have been accustomed to for years. All merchandise in the store will be discounted 20-50 percent. Tailoring for men and women will be available during the silent sale.

"We have so many customers that have made this business what it is today," he said.

The special sale will also serve a dual purpose for Chuck. Anyone who may be interested in renting the store space can come in, speak with him and pick-up some pointers. Once the Laphams close their doors for the silent sale, they will reopen Nov. 25 with a liquidation sale, which will last, most likely, till the end of December to the middle of January, he said.

In the store's place, Lapham would like to see another business that will provide a valuable service

to the community, like another men's or women's clothing store.

"We have a good base of restaurants and gift shops here, but we need more stores downtown that provide people with a service," he said.

In the hope of keeping that goal alive, Chuck said he is willing to spend time to give advice and council to any prospective renter who is considering opening a store in its place.

The closing of the downtown store in no way amounts to retirement for Chuck, who also owns a storage business on Novi Road, Cal's Car Care Inc. and Lapham's Development. He also is involved in several civic projects.

The juggling act he has sustained for years in managing his businesses while staying active in the community, however, was

starting to get too much.

"I don't have the time to devote to everything so something has to go," he said. "I just have to slow down to a dull roar."

One aspect of the clothing business that factored into his decision to close was the trend toward the wearing of casual attire to work as opposed to formal business suits - something that has caused a 15 percent loss in sales in the past three years, Chuck said.

"I don't look at this as a short-term cycle (casual wear to the office)," Lapham hasn't had the time to mull over the sentimental aspect of shutting down his longtime business, but he knows that time is coming soon.

"When I turn out the lights for the last time, that will be a sad day," he said.

City eliminates budget shortfall

The annual audit report of the City of Northville provided information that put a smile on Northville City Council's collective face.

According to the audit, conducted by the certified public accounting firm of Plante & Moran, the \$149,476 budget deficit with which the city began the 1993 fiscal year has been eliminated.

Currently, city officials are sitting comfortably with a fund balance of \$148,373.

"When I look at the numbers,

and how bad we were and where we have come, I'm very impressed," said Mayor Chris Johnson.

Michael Swartz of Plante & Moran praised the city's efficiency in managing its budget deficit. However, he urged city officials to increase their fund equity as a safety cushion for possible unforeseen financial problems in the future.

"While you're doing a great job as far as building fund equity, there's still some more building to do before you're out of the woods," Swartz said.

Swartz recommended that the city should work toward building its fund equity up to 5 percent, or \$400,000, of its approximately \$4 million budget. However, a 10 percent or higher fund balance would be ideal, he added.

Swartz also recommended that the city consider hiring additional support staff to assist City Manager Gary Word in his administrative duties.

Projecting city operation expenditures beyond the current or upcoming fiscal year may also be effective in helping to build fund equity in the future, he said.

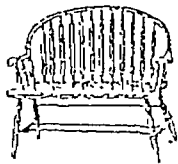

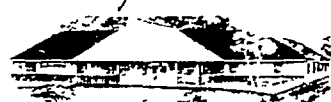

Township commission approves new market

The Northville Township Planning Commission last month gave the thumbs-up to a Shopping Center Market slated for the corner of Five Mile and Haggerty Roads.

The proposal has undergone big changes to satisfy the concerns several commissioners voiced about it earlier this summer, including the size of the store - too big a building on too tiny a lot - and the potential noise and appearance.

The commission's Oct. 14 blessing is conditional, however, as the proposal has to meet a few minor conditions before approval is final-

ized. That won't be hard, township planning officials say, and James Hiller should soon be able to begin construction of the grocery store.

Hiller and his family own six supermarkets in the metro Detroit area, including the Shopping Center Market in Northville. His newest proposal calls for a 47,000 square foot store and related parking on six acres of land that sits at the northwest corner of Five Mile and Haggerty.

The first version of the plan, calling for a 52,000 square foot building, didn't pass muster with the commission or with some of those who live near the Five and

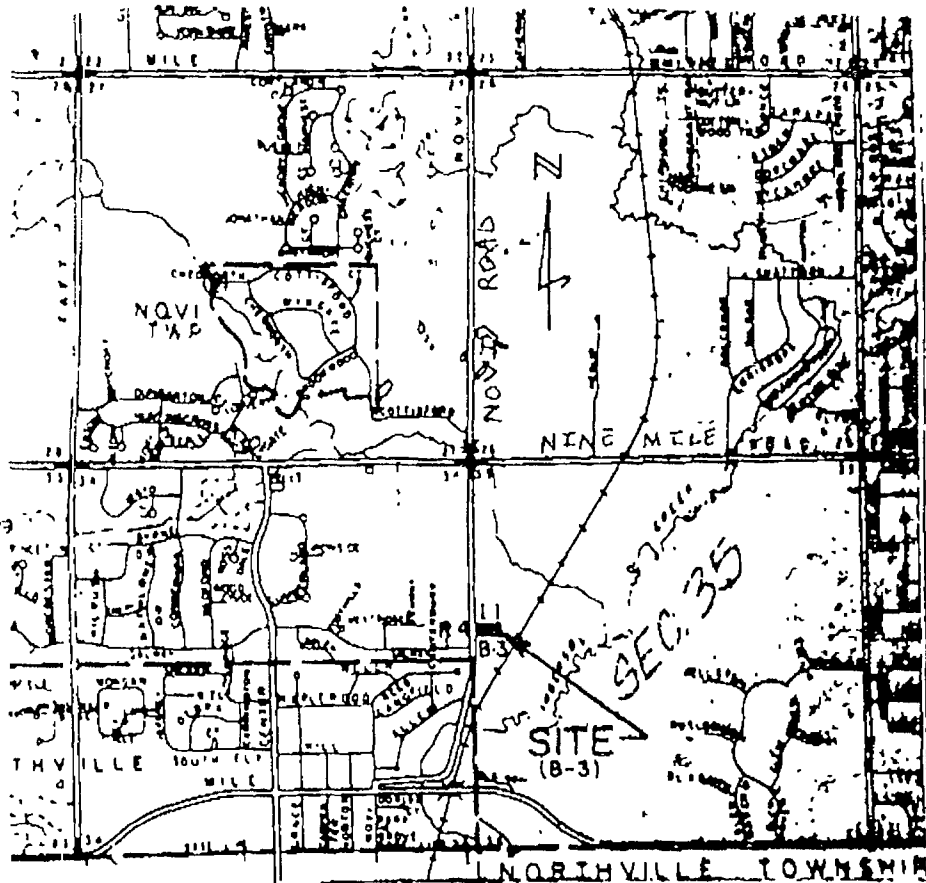
Haggerty intersection. They expressed a variety of concerns at an Aug. 30 commission meeting, including the fact that the store was too large for the parcel, that it didn't have enough parking and that it could generate a lot of traffic and noise.

Trees were being removed to build it, some complained, and landscaping measures to shield the Market from nearby homes needed to be beefed up.

David Mielock, Hiller's architect, reduced the size of the store, putting it further back from Haggerty and reducing its impact on the site.

Mill Race Matters

Mill Race Village opens Saturday, Nov. 19, and Sunday, Nov. 20, from noon until 5 p.m. for its traditional Christmas Walk. Docents will discuss building and community history in six of the eight buildings.

Additionally, craft demonstrators will be recreating Victorian crafts in each location. Crafters will include a lacemaker, a blacksmith, basket makers, weavers and spinners and a Victorian school reenactor. Private collections displayed will include antique lace bobbins, antique toys and pressed glass goblets. Numerous items will be available for sale from the Country Store, the Mill Race Weaver's Guild, and the Mill Race Basket Guild. Admission is \$2.50 for adults and \$1.25 for children under 12.

Cheryl Gazley has been named the Northville Historical Society's third office manager replacing Renee Brown who resigned as a result of bad health. The first office manager, Sally Henrickson, left this spring to pursue other volunteer endeavors with the organization.

Gazley and her husband Christopher have been members of the Historical Society since its earliest days. She served previously on the group's dances and the most recent Progressive Dinner. Cheryl worked in a variety of capacities including that of office manager and substitute teacher. She was a founding member of the Northville Arts Commission. Currently she coaches Northville High School's Debate Team.

Northville's first European settlers began to arrive in 1825. Shortly thereafter, John Miller with the aid

of Isiah Nash constructed a grist mill. The mill became the first business in what was to become the Village of Northville. With the completion of the mill other residents gathered in the area and began to establish businesses. That mill was located on the site of today's Mill Race Village. Other early businesses centered in the area as well probably due to the convenience of access to the Rouge River.

By 1831 the Village center moved to Main and Center where it remains today. In that year local residents gathered in the store owned by the Mead brothers on the corner where Orrin's Jewelers stands today and decided to call their village Northville. At the first separation during the 1860s the village became an incorporated entity. Thirty years later during the 1890s Northville Township was carved from the upper half of Plymouth Township. Most townships in the state are plated as 36 square miles, but Plymouth and Northville only had 18 square miles each as a result of the split. By the time Northville became a city during the 1950s portions of Oakland County had joined it expanding its boundaries to the north.



Adult living center approved for Northville Township site

Northville Township will soon host a new "adult living center."

That's not a euphemism for "nursing home," according to the developer. An adult living center, developer Mike Damone said, is for senior citizens who can use a little help now and again but don't require a lot of specialized medical care.

The township's board of trustees cleared the way for the center to become reality near the corner of Six Mile and Haggerty with an Oct. 27 vote.

The trustees gave final approval to the proposal for Brookstone, a 50-odd home subdivision slated for 33 acres just south of Six Mile and just west of Haggerty. Included in the sub's plan is Wynfield House, the 72-bed adult living center.

The facility will take up

about three acres and share a large recreational open space with the subdivision. The homes in Brookstone will average about 12,000 square feet and run in the \$275,000-\$300,000 range.

Wynfield House is for physically frail seniors who don't need a lot of medical help. It follows the same design of a dozen other similar facilities that Damone's company operates in Wisconsin and Michigan.

Living center residents tend to be people aged 80 or older, Damone said, who don't drive and have an adult child living within seven miles of the facility. Wynfield House will be staffed with licensed care professionals who offer essential services and handle activities for the residents. Sixty rooms are planned, some for couples.

Living in Wynfield House won't be cheap; it will average about

\$85 a day, or \$31,000 a year. The price rules out those who rely solely on Medicare/Medicaid funding.

West Bloomfield developer Larry Cohen is handling Brookstone, Damone company's Wynfield House. Together they agreed to a compromise deal township officials arranged. That called for the subdivision's infrastructure and two model homes to be under construction before allowing the adult living center to open.

The idea is to prevent "spot development." Township officials said they did not want to see Wynfield House go in first, with promises that the sub would follow. That, they said, could allow a developer to come back - amidst protests of a depressed housing market - and ask for permission to build a business center there. Cohen and Damone said they're committed to the plan.

Vanlandingham is also coordinating the Plymouth office's "Adopt a Family" Christmas program. More than 500 families this year will receive a special package containing food, health and hygienic items and a gift for each person.

"We hope to give each of them a big Christmas," Vanlandingham said.

The Salvation Army will run its annual "League of Mercy" program this year as well.

"We're hoping to spread a little cheer to folks in institutions in the area," Vanlandingham said.

Army members visit nursing homes in Northville, Plymouth and Canton every month, he said, but put in extra effort during the holidays.

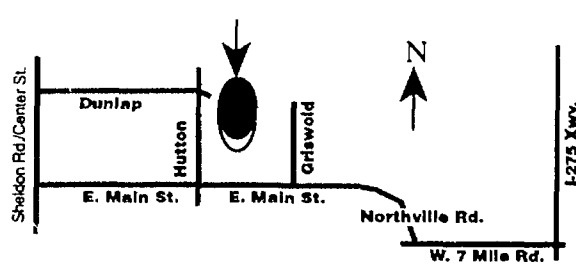

Police catch up to robbery suspect

Street smarts and team work led Northville Township police to a career criminal and alleged thief last week.

By working together, township officers arrested the man they believe was responsible for an early-morning Nov. 4 break-in at the Six & Park party store on Northville Road — two minutes after it happened. In the process, police recovered more than \$1,300 worth of cigarettes they say William Larry Johnson stole from the establishment.

Johnson — 44 and a Westland resident — was arraigned later that day before 35th District Court Judge John MacDonald. He is being held in the Wayne County Jail on a \$25,000 cash bond. Johnson faces a preliminary exam today in connection with the Friday break-in.

Johnson, police Detective John Werth said, "has an extensive criminal history," including connections with cases involving theft, drugs and even homicide.

Nov. 4, 1:27 a.m., found him cruising the streets of Northville Township.

Officer Kevin Bias stopped Johnson's 1981 Cadillac Seville not far from the Six & Park store because it had no license plates. The driver identified himself as Cary Bernard Myles, 52, from Inkster. He said he was lost and was looking for the I-275 freeway and did not have his driver's license with him.

Two minutes before, police had

received a report of the store's alarm going off. Six & Park is located at the intersection of Northville Road and Six Mile. The Cadillac was the only vehicle in the area, Bias said.

That fact raised police suspicions, as did Officer Jim Fisher's report that he had seen the car in the area over an hour before. Fisher saw the Cadillac near Seven Mile and Northville Road, but didn't stop it because he was dispatched to respond to another incident.

Meanwhile, Officer Greg Rhodes and Sergeant Raymond Garbarino were checking out Six & Park. They discovered that the front door dead had been forcibly removed, causing \$50 in damage. The two checked the store for suspects but found no one.

They did find a large number of cartons of cigarettes scattered on the floor, they said.

Bias eventually placed the man under arrest for not having his license while driving. He then searched the car, finding tools on the front passenger seat and a large cache of cigarettes in the trunk.

The owner of Six & Park later identified the cigarettes as his and said they worth \$1,360.

Werth praised the efforts of the officers involved. "This was an outstanding piece of police work."

Johnson later admitted his real name. He faces two charges: breaking and entering and an additional charge of being an habitual offender.

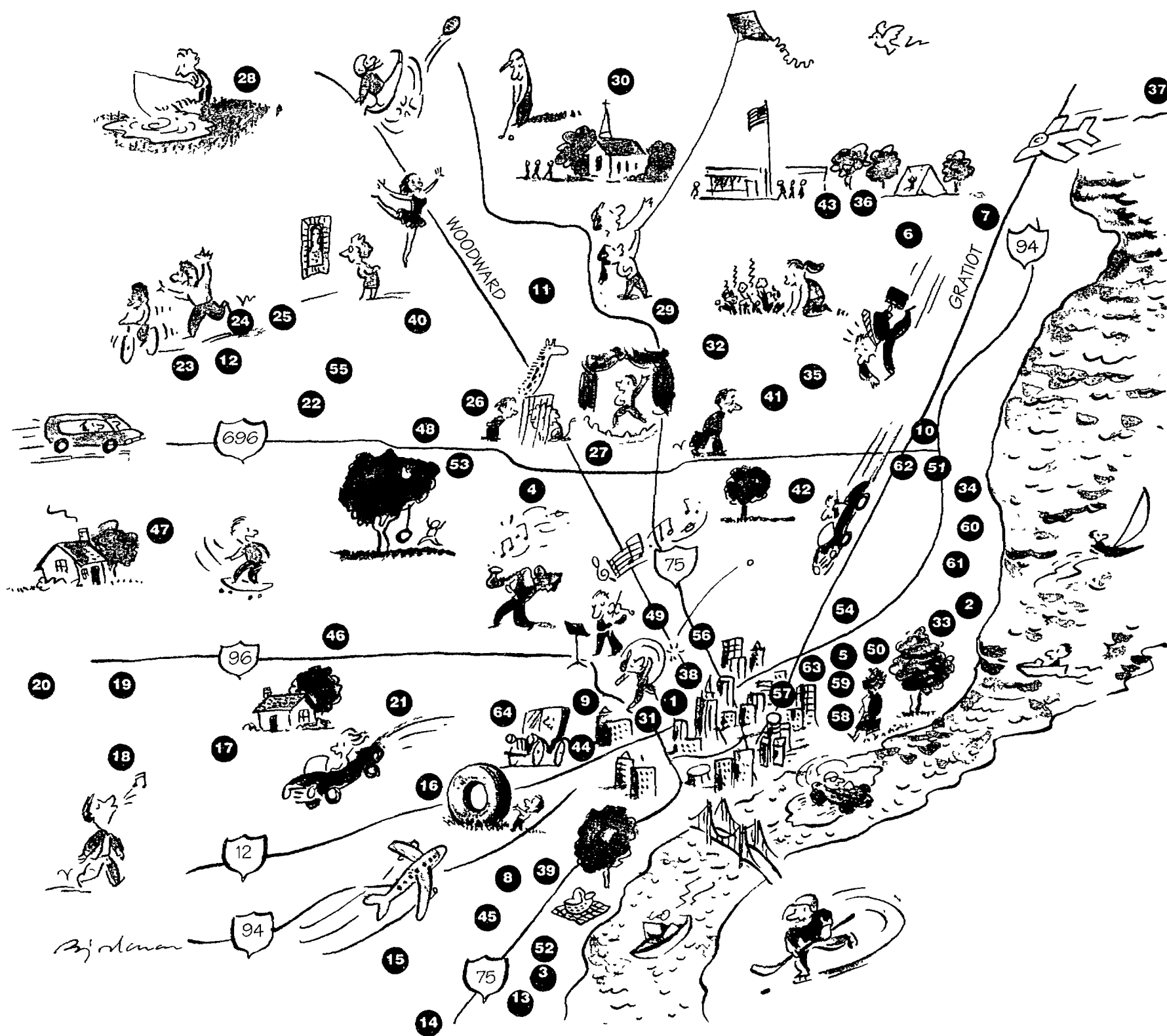

9-1-1 charge will show up on phone bills

Northville residents will see a new charge on their phone bills soon, but the money is going to a worthy cause.

The new, small fee will be assessed beginning this month on township and Wayne County city residents. The money it raises will pay for improving Northville's 9-1-1 emergency service.

The state Legislature approved the new fee in March, giving individual counties in Michigan the option to assess it. Wayne County's Commission gave the green light to do so in August.

The money collected from the new charge is over and above the 9-1-1 fee now charged to phone users every month. It's legally earmarked for use in buying 9-1-1 equipment or paying for dispatchers. The idea is to help rural counties - who have few dollars for

upgrading their emergency response systems - get some cash to do so.

The charge will be tacked onto individual phone users' monthly bills: four percent of the monthly flat rate that the phone company charges you for a single-access line. If your flat rate fee each month is \$20, for example, your new 9-1-1 charge will be 80 cents a month. All residential and business telephone users in the county will be charged for it from now through the year 2002.

Ameritech will collect the fee from individual users, total the money gathered from each community and then send it to that community each month. The township will only get money collected from township residents, and the city only from the city. Officials should be seeing the first of the checks in January.

Only residents of Northville Township and the Wayne County section of Northville City will pay the new fee. Oakland County city residents will not, as the Oakland County Commission has not yet voted in favor of the funding plan.

The amount of cash that the township and city would receive has yet to be determined. City Police Chief Rod Cannon said that no decisions have been made on what to do with the money, as officials are waiting to see how much it will total.

Township Director of Public Safety Chip Snider said he has recommended that the board of trustees consider using the fee monies to finance a new emergen-

cy dispatch radio. The department's current radio is old and subject to breakdown, he said.

"That radio does need replacing," Snider said. "It's a safety hazard."

The radio has experienced power failures in the past, the director said, and sometimes fails to transmit signals to emergency personnel. Spare parts are almost impossible to come by. A new radio can cost as much as \$200,000 and take as long as four months to install.

If the existing unit were to fail, the township would work with Northville City's dispatch center until a permanent solution could be arranged.

Dial different number when making emergency calls on cellular phones

In an emergency, call 9-1-1. That's the advice we've all heard for years, right? Well, now Northville Township and City officials are offering a little footnote.

If you're using a cellular phone to report an emergency in Northville, police officials say valuable time can be saved by calling them directly at 349-9400 (township) or 349-1234 (city).

If you don't remember, don't worry, they say. Dialing 9-1-1 is still the thing to do. However, because of the way cellular phone 9-1-1 calls are handled, dialing directly may save a minute or two. That's precious seconds in a life-or-death situation.

Non-cellular phones will automatically route your 9-1-1 call to the nearest police department. Calls to the emergency line made on cellular phones, however, are handled by the Michigan State Police.

State police posts receive the cellular calls, then turn around and alert the nearest police department to the reported problem. The extra step can mean a delay in response time, so township Fire Chief Bill Zmenda is working to get cellular phone users to remember to "dial direct."

"When you dial 9-1-1 on your cellular phone, it's hard to tell who you'll get," he said. "It's amazing how many people are under the impression that they'll get some-

body in their community."

That was what happened on Oct. 5 near the intersection of Bradner and Steepleview in the township. At about 4:30 that afternoon, a 14-year-old boy hit a rock while riding his bicycle. He was thrown from the bike, getting a bad cut on his right knee and scrapes on both elbows.


A woman called 9-1-1 on her cellular phone to report the incident. It was picked up by the state police, who transferred it to the City of Northville, who then bumped it to the City of Novi, and finally to the township.

"There was a perception that we took an excessive amount of time in responding," Zmenda said.

In reality, however, township medical personnel were on the scene within six minutes. Zmenda said he's working with local school teachers and parents to educate citizens about 9-1-1. Information will be placed on the township's cable access channel and stickers are being printed as well.

The stickers are for township cellular phone users, reminding them to call 349-9400 to report an emergency which occurs in the township.

City Chief of police Rod Cannon said that city residents using cellular phones to report city emergencies should dial city police directly at 349-1234.

Stalking suspect awaits trial in jail

Accused last month of stalking his ex-wife, a 60-year-old Oak Park man now faces a second stalking charge.

He will await trial on both counts behind bars.

Northville Township police received two complaints from the woman, a township resident, about her husband in October.

She claimed he had been repeatedly stalking and harassing her, calling her on the phone and driving by her home. Once he broke

into the house, she claimed.

The couple is divorced and the woman has two judicial restraining orders forbidding the man to come near her, their children or their home.

Police arrested the man on a felony charge of aggravated stalking on Oct. 14.

Aggravated stalking is a felony in Michigan, carrying a maximum prison sentence of five years.

The man was arraigned later that day before 35th District Court before Judge James Garber.

He pled not guilty and was ordered held on a \$1,000 cash bond. The man eventually posted the bail and was released.

On Oct. 25, the woman called police again, saying that her ex-husband was parked in his car in her driveway. He was gone, however, by the time a patrol car arrived.

Detective Fred Yankee requested and received a warrant for the man's arrest after the incident, but was unable to locate him.

On Nov. 3, the woman again called township police. This time

she said that her ex-husband had been in the area that morning, watching their children as they left for school. He was gone by the time police arrived, however.

The following day, Nov. 4, the man appeared at Wayne County Circuit Court for a hearing on the first stalking charge.

Yankee arrested him there.

The man's bail was set at \$250,000 cash. His preliminary exam is set for today in 35th District Court.

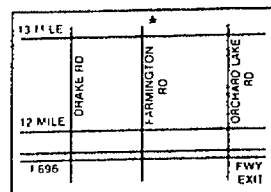

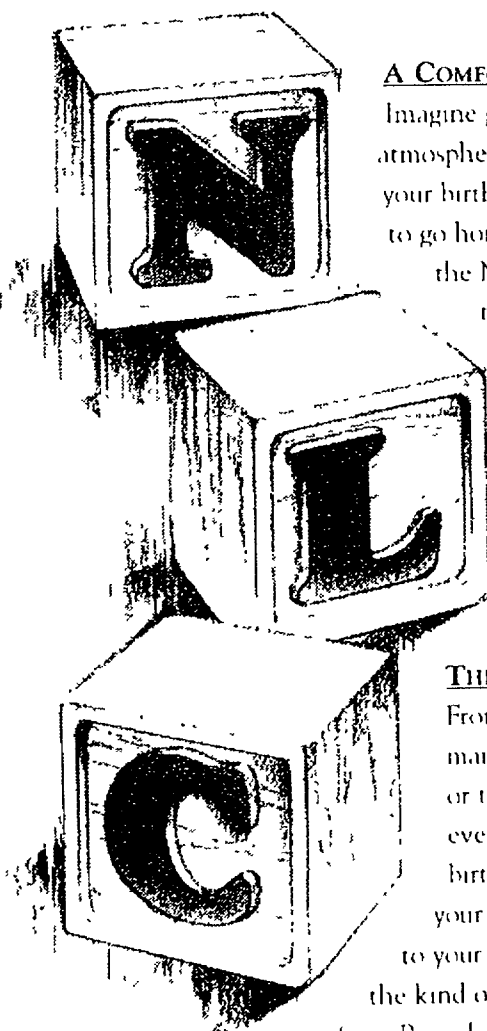

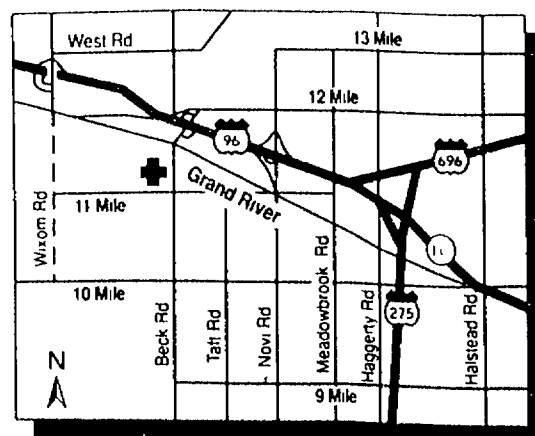

High court reviews sentencing practices of judges

The Michigan Supreme Court is studying whether one area judge is too lenient and two others are too harsh in handing out prison sentences.

At issue: Did the judges have "substantial and compelling" reasons for departing from — up or down — from state sentencing guidelines?

• Oakland Circuit Judge Edward Sosnick was accused of "undermining" law enforcement by giving a convicted drug dealer only half the minimum possible sentence. Arguing that view was Robert C. Williams of the Oakland County prosecutor's office.

• Wayne Circuit Judge Michael Talbot, already famed for having his lengthy "basketball score" sentences overturned by appellate courts, was accused of "goad[ing] this court, seeing how far he can push this court" by giving a 60-120-year sentence when guidelines call for 10-25 years. That view was advanced by Northville Township

attorney Carolyn Blanchard.

Tough sentences by Talbot and former Judge Richard Cunningham were argued in a third case. The cases involving Talbot, who was raised in Livonia, are politically hot because he was Gov. John Engler's unsuccessful 1992 candidate for the Supreme Court.

The high court may not rule before the fall of 1995, when at least one justice who heard oral arguments Thursday will be gone. Justice Robert Griffin, a Republican who has supported Talbot in the past, will retire at the end of the year. Justice Conrad Mallett Jr., a Democrat, is facing a tough reelection battle.

After Southfield drug dealer Warren Fields pleaded guilty in 1991 to possession with intent to deliver between 50 and 225 grams of cocaine, Judge Sosnick gave him a five-year minimum sentence. The law specifies a 10-year minimum but allows less if the judge finds "substantial and compelling reasons."

Prosecutor Richard Thompson

appealed the sentence as too light, and the Court of Appeals reversed Sosnick. So now Fields is appealing to the state's highest court. Ironically, Sosnick, of Bloomfield Township, was an assistant prosecutor before becoming a trial judge.

"As a general practitioner," said defense lawyer Stuart A. Young of Birmingham, "I would like to be able to advise my client what he should do (plead guilty and hope for a lighter sentence or risk a trial)."

"My client wants to know, 'What are substantial and compelling reasons?' And that's a problem," said Young. "He never sold to anybody other than the undercover officer. He gave the name of the guy he got it from."

"It's a typical low- to mid-level case," said assistant prosecutor Williams, arguing for the standard sentence. "He was higher than a street-level dealer. He had a mobile phone and a pager."

"He thought he could do better in front of Judge Sosnick if he

pleaded guilty and tried to show rehabilitation. We believe strongly he (Fields) should be responsible for his action. He gave no indication of any offer to cooperate."

Commented Justice Charles Levin: "Clearly the Legislature has stated a policy and then stated an exception in the vaguest possible way."

"This defendant prowled the community looking for small bags of garbage, indicating a senior citizen!" said assistant Wayne County prosecutor Carolyn Breen.

She said she drew a graphic word picture of Bashara Merriweather, 19, breaking into an 84-year-old Detroit woman's home, smashing a light bulb over her head, demanding money, inserting something in her anus and torturing her buttocks with hot knives when she refused him money.

"This was planned sexual torture," Breen said. "(Sentencing) guidelines don't anticipate this action. These facts indicate a sentence beyond the guidelines."

Defense attorney Blanchard said

the guidelines called for 10-25 years. Instead Judge Talbot gave Merriweather 60 to 120 years, longer than he would have to serve on his life sentence (for assault) before he could be eligible for parole.

"Judge Talbot is goading this court, seeing how far he can push this court," Blanchard said. "The Court of Appeals said this is not a proportionate sentence; this is not a reasoned sentence. You have to give a sentence reviewable by a parole board."

Said Justice Patricia Boyle: "The judge is obviously trying to avoid a parole board with this sentence."

"Obviously," replied Blanchard. She said it was Merriweather's first arrest and that he had been acquitted of other charges.

Justice Levin asked prosecutor Breen: "What do you think the lowest sentence should have been?"

Breen: "60 years was proportionate."

Levin: "If the sentence had been 30 to 60, would the prosecutor

have appealed?"

Breen: "I don't know what we would have done."

Merriweather is serving 10-15 years for breaking and entering, life for assault and 60-120 for criminal sexual conduct.

Two different judges gave John Henry Houston, 26, sentences of 25-50 years for raping a young cousin — triple the term called for by the sentencing guidelines. Talbot's first sentence was remanded by the Court of Appeals, but Judge Richard Cunningham gave the same sentence in the 1987 Detroit case.

Attorney David A. Moran of the State Appellate Defender's Office protested the length of the sentence and Cunningham's irritated remarks to defense attorney Dennis Shrewsbury of Plymouth: "Whose idea was this to bring in so many witnesses?"

Moran said Cunningham invaded the attorney-client privilege by probing Shrewsbury on who was most responsible for planning Houston's defense.

Killer's verdict upheld

Mark VanSickle will serve the rest of his 13-year prison sentence for second-degree murder now that a state Court of Appeals panel has affirmed his guilty verdict.

VanSickle, now 35, formerly of Novi, was convicted by a jury of the murder charge after he pleaded guilty to charges of third-offense drunk driving and driving on a suspended license in the 1991 death of Alexander Flees, 4.

The collision occurred when VanSickle's truck, which he knew had faulty brakes, went through a red light on Pontiac Trail and struck the rear passenger side of a southbound car on Haggerty Road in which the boy was riding.

Oakland Circuit Judge Deborah Tyner sentenced VanSickle to 13 years and eight months to 20 years in prison — which VanSickle's attorney appealed as disproportionate. Appellate Judges William B. Murphy and Harold Hood, joined by Detroit Records Judge Prentis Edwards, upheld the sentence, saying:

"Defendant's sentence was within the sentencing guidelines of 10 to 25 years and is therefore presumptively proportionate. We have reviewed the record and conclude that, in light of the seriousness of the circumstances surrounding the offense and defendant's history of offenses associated with consuming alcohol and driving, the sentence was proportionate."

VanSickle paid for the truck in

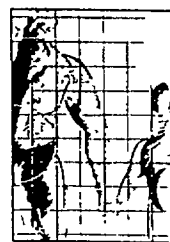
mid-1991 knowing it had no rear brakes. As the appeals court recited the facts:

"On Sept. 30, 1991, defendant consumed about six beers between approximately 11:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. After consuming the beer, defendant got into the truck and drove it even though he knew the truck's brakes did not work."

The collision occurred about 4:30 p.m. Two blood tests revealed his blood alcohol level at 0.23 and 0.25 percent, more than twice the legal drunk level. His trial attorney asked Judge Tyner for a directed verdict of acquittal on the second-degree murder charge on the ground there was no malice.

But the appeals judges said the verdict was warranted because VanSickle "knowingly created a very high risk of great bodily harm ... Defendant had knowledge that the master cylinder was out and that the truck had no brakes. He admitted that he had done nothing to repair the brakes in the month he had owned the truck."

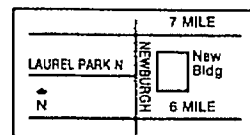

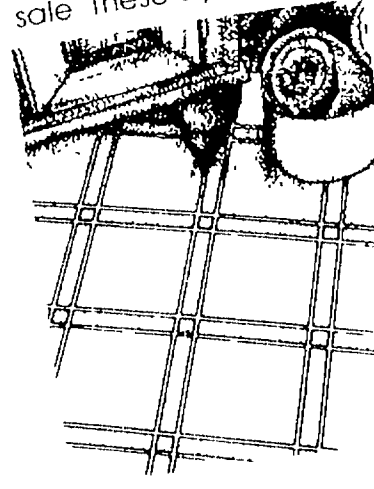

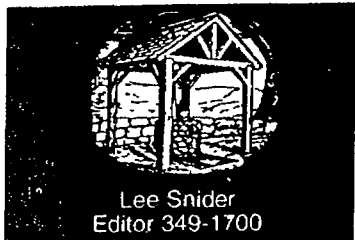

Citizens need to keep watch over arena plan

Have some members of Northville Township's board of trustees done wrong when it comes to the recent proposal for a multi-purpose sports arena on Beck Road?

Some people in the township are saying that Treasurer Rick Engelland, and maybe Clerk Sue Hillebrand and Supervisor Karen Baja, are going overboard when it comes to resident John Hamilton's plan for the \$8.5 million facility. Accusations of trustees getting special treatment for a pet project have been leveled at them, Engelland in particular.

There's not enough evidence to say that's true, so we'll give all three the benefit of the doubt - for now. The Record will keep a weather eye on events concerning this proposal, however, and we urge township citizens to do the same.

Hamilton's plan, announced publicly for the first time last month, is interesting. It calls for a 124,000 square foot arena on 12 acres of land he owns off of Beck Road between Five and Six Mile.

Plans for two ice rinks with spectator seating, three basketball courts, an indoor running track and a Powerhouse Gym have been discussed, among other amenities. Also included would be a restaurant, for which Hamilton is asking township approval of a liquor license. The arena would be privately financed and owned.

It's no secret that Rick Engelland supports this plan. He's spent a lot of time over the last year trying to get an ice arena built in Northville Township, either on public or private land, with either public or private money.

That's fine: Engelland is a member of this community, cares about it and is trying to bring something here that he - a lot of other people - feel would be a great addition to Northville Township. He's absolutely right when he points out that recreation opportunities for this community are few and far between.

However, his actions have led some people to wonder just how far he'll go to get an ice arena here.

In December, he proposed building a \$5 million, two-rink job on land the township owns off of Seven Mile. The township would own the arena and hire a professional management company to run it. Engelland's plan called for the \$5 million to be raised through the sale of "revenue bonds."

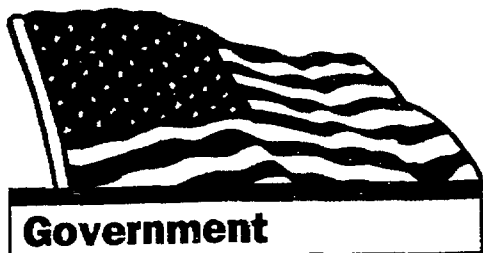
Investors buying the bonds get their dividends from the profits the arena would supposedly generate. If it went belly-up, they would be out of luck: creditors couldn't back the moving vans up to Township Hall to repossess everything and then sell it for their cash.

That would not happen, Engelland was convinced. He said the market for ice time in this area is huge and the township rink would mean a hefty annual dose of money for township coffers.

The board of trustees held a public hearing on the idea in January, although it was supposedly for considering any uses of the Seven Mile Property. After that, the board directed the township's planning department to put together a committee to consider that later purpose.

At that point, the whole thing was put on ice for months, as the committee did its work - work that was canceled this summer by Engelland, Hillebrand and Baja.

Sometime this summer, Hamilton approached them privately about his plan. Shortly after that, Engelland publicly discussed a new idea: an \$8.5 million, multi-purpose sports arena on the Seven Mile land, or possibly on an



unnamed piece of property on the west side of the township.

This time, Engelland proposed an alternative financing option: issuing general obligation tax bonds to build the arena, because the township would get a lower interest rate than on a revenue bond sale.

The downside of general bonds, however, is that investors can demand repayment from the township directly if the arena were to fail, potentially meaning an \$8.5 million debt for taxpayers.

In July, Engelland mentioned the plan and the financing option in a letter to skating families. In it, he says that the township's executive committee has "endorsed" the plan.

Baja and Hillebrand say they've taken part in two meetings with Hamilton on the proposal, saying Engelland's been the one focusing the most attention on it. They all say, however, that nothing wrong has been done.

As township officials, board members often meet with developers to discuss proposals, they say: just to exchange information and not to subvert the public planning approval process.

Besides that, Engelland said he was acting as a private citizen and did nothing inappropriate.

Not everyone's so sure of that, however, given more recent events.

On the evening of Oct. 17, the township's planning commission met in two back-to-back sub-quorum meetings to hear about the plan for the first time. Although they were publicly posted in accordance with the state's Open Meetings Act, it all seemed to be an effort to keep things quiet on the Hamilton plan, and some planning commissioners said so.

Five days later, on Oct. 22, Engelland sent out another letter to township skaters, telling them in detail about Hamilton's plan, including the fact that he expects to ask the township for a 12-year tax abatement, and urges them to rally support for the arena.

Three days after that, the commission was presented with a proposed revision of township zoning ordinance. The amendment would modify the language concerning special land use permits to include "commercial recreational establishments" - which would include the Hamilton arena.

The amendment, planning workers say, is part of a township-wide zoning ordinance makeover. While Hamilton's plan was a catalyst for working on it, it was not the cause of it, they maintain.

Despite that, eyebrows were raised over the whole thing. Questions have been asked: Did Engelland and the others give Hamilton special treatment? Did they "encourage" township planning employees to work on his proposal and the amendment that affects it?

We think that the evidence is inconclusive. It's hard sometimes to tell where someone stops being a private citizen backing something and starts inappropriately using his or her clout as a public official.

We think Hamilton's proposal deserves very thoughtful consideration, but should go through the regular channels. We urge township citizens to keep watch on it, just to make sure that it does.

We walked hand in hand. We shopped. She purchased a bracelet with her week's allowance. We had a bite to eat. Then we shopped some more.

Trends noticeable from election

The election of 1994, certainly one of the most tumultuous and angry in my memory, is finally over.

Now that the votes have been counted and the dust is settled, I sense three major underlying trends which will drive the evolution of our political system for years to come.

1. Our political and governmental system is now so complex - so filled with checks and balances, so vulnerable to blocking vetoes by determined, single-issue groups - that it is now nearly impossible to get anything significant done. No wonder most voters feel helpless and frustrated.

Consider just two recent examples, one large

and one small.
Charter schools are among the most promising innovations in Michigan education. When state voters passed Proposal A, they authorized creation of a number of experiments, from the dubious (the Noah Webster Academy, a home-school network) to the admirable (Wayne State University's academy, aimed at inner city youth).

Predictably, those with most to lose from a less monopolistic school system sued. And last week, Ingham Circuit Judge William Collette threw out the baby with the bath water by ruling that all charter schools are unconstitutional, necessitating endless appeals and probably killing some of the most promising starts.

A teacher friend reports that students in her class no longer don costumes for Halloween because a small group of parents protested to the school board, claiming that Satanism was being sanctioned when kids dressed up.

2. Political relationships have evolved from the concrete and personal to the abstract ephemera of the 30-second TV spot. No wonder most voters feel manipulated and alienated.

In the pre-TV days, campaigning was conducted up close and personal, with candidates walking door to door, making their speeches before audiences of real people, trying to answer real questions.

No longer. Speeches are out, 30-second spots are in; events are staged for media consumption, questions are pre-scripted. How many candidates did you get a chance to look in the eye during the campaign? Not many, I'd bet.

All this inevitably disconnects voters from candidates whose persona consists almost entirely of an electronic image. "They're not the same type of day-to-day people as you and me," said a warehouse worker quoted in *The New York Times*. "They're in a completely different world. They aren't somebody you would want to socialize with."

3. Enough people feel frustrated enough with the workings of the present system to provide the preconditions for political realignment. Maybe.

One striking thing about this year's election was how well Jon Coon ran as the Libertarian candidate for U.S. Senate. Third-party candidates typically do very badly in our political system, but Coon's showing this year suggests the same kind of yearning for something new that produced all those votes for Ross Perot two years ago.

I wouldn't be surprised to see fundamental stresses shake up Michigan's political system over the next few years.

Gov. John Engler may have won a landslide, but he'll have a tough time governing in the center and simultaneously keeping the Religious Right in the GOP. And there are plenty of Democrats who think their party will remain brain dead as long as it is dominated by organized labor as it is today.

Who knows? We may wind up with a Republican Party controlled by the Religious Right, the Democratic Party run by organized labor and liberals, and some kind of coalition between moderates of both parties uneasily occupying the center.

New recycling drop-off point now open

If you're looking for an alternative place to get rid of your recyclables besides the Novi center, try the Resource Recovery and Recycling Authority of Southwest Oakland County (RRRASOC).

The authority opened its new Citizen's Drop-off center at its equally new Recycle America-Metro Detroit/Material Recovery Facility (MRF) on Oct. 31. It's at 2000 W. Eight Mile Road, at the northwest corner of Eight Mile and Evergreen Road.

Novi is one of eight member communities of RRRASOC, which was formerly headquartered in this city.

The 53,000-square-foot MRF is

designed to process 250 tons of recycled material per day collected from residential curbside collections and commercial recycling pick-ups, as well as the Citizen Drop-off.

You may jettison newspapers, cardboard, metal, glass and certain plastics at the Drop-Off Center from Mondays through Fridays from 6 a.m. to 5 p.m. and on Saturday from 6 a.m. to 1 a.m.

Here's what is accepted:

- Plastics - Small-mouthed No. 1 and No. 2 containers such as milk jugs, water bottles, laundry detergent bottles and juice bottles; LDPE and HDPE plastic film, in other words number No. 4 and No.

2 plastic film only, such as shrink wrap and produce bags; polystyrene foam, such as clean food trays and plates and packaging peanuts.

- Glass - All clear, brown and green food and beverage jars and bottles, but no lids or rings. Containers must be rinsed and dry.

- Metal - All steel, tin and bi-metal containers, aluminum beverage containers, aluminum foil, food trays and wrappers. No lids or aerosol cans. All metal should be rinsed.

- Paper - Newspaper, magazines, glossy catalogs, newspaper inserts and mailers, white and colored copier paper, white and colored

ledger paper, note pads and loose leaf filler, white and green-bar computer paper, manila folders, adding machine tape, non-glossy brochures and pamphlets. No window envelopes, post-it notes, carbon paper, fax paper or wood. All paper must be dry.

- Cardboard - Old corrugated cardboard, box board, gray board, paper board. No wood, food, office paper, foam, rice-based, waxed or plastic-coated cardboard.

RECOVERING FROM HIP REPLACEMENT SURGERY

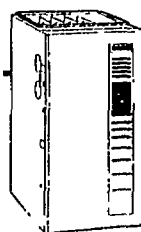

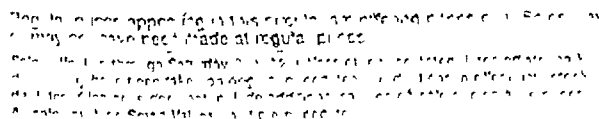

The camera slowly zooms in on a shiny sedan parked precisely so that reflections from the sun and the sky can be seen in its spotless paint.

It is a perfect description of what the television viewer sees in a commercial and it took place in Northville. It all sounds so idyllic. But setting up a shoot, as television commercial filming is called, can have its share of near tragedies before it gets to the polished piece thousands will view night after night and take for granted.

For Northville director Dan Hackett, an assignment starts only two or three weeks before the day of shooting. One of the four agencies Hackett works with will send a script, sometimes with a storyboard sometimes without.

"I'm one of the few directors who can draw, so I'll do a storyboard," said Hackett. A storyboard is a written version of the commercial, with drawings of each scene to be included.

"Corporations want to be kept apprised of every step so they're not totally surprised when they see it," said Hackett. "There are lots of cumbersome but important procedures."

Locations for commercials depends on the idea and the budget. For the Ford Sable commercial shot in Northville recently, money was tight because it was a dealership not a national job.

"It was for New England Ford dealers and they wanted a New England look," said Hackett. "I only had a week and I know Northville."

Hackett suggested his hometown for the shoot because he knew the people and could get clearance on

such short notice.

"It looks beautiful, the colors look great, and it looks New England," he said. "When you're shooting cars it's very difficult because the car reflects everything so it has to be in a great place and it has to have great lighting. If it doesn't have great lighting it looks awful."

Hackett had to set up the shoot after having only two days to scout out Northville. On top of the short notice, the sun never came out on either day of scouting.

"We figured the sun would be in a certain place but the weather report said it wasn't coming out until the next afternoon," said Hackett. "When we got there in the morning, the full sun was out and we had to switch the whole shoot around."

Walkie talkies were used to redirect the trucks bringing in the cars, which were all going to the wrong location.

When the viewer sees the commercial the question may come to mind that if the sun was out why is the street wet? Black top and cement are really ugly dry, Hackett said.

"You see oil stains, cracks, garbage, dead squirrels, you see everything. When you wet it down it reflects the color of the sky," Hackett said. "It reflects some of the car back into it." But it is a director's nightmare. "You have to keep the car clean and the roads are wet, it is very cumbersome."

"But the commercials came out really well," he said. "Northville has so much character, so much personality. It is so beautifully tight together so that when you're lining up shots there's lots of information."

One scene for the commercial was shot outside Hackett's house and his neighbor's.

"We were on his (the neighbor's) lawn and I'm thinking did anyone tell them what's going on," said Hackett's wife, Nancy.

"I'm nervous when we shoot in town," said Hackett. "We live here so we try to have a good time and involve people and clean up after ourselves. I know of a lot of LA companies come in and they're slightly abusive and surly and they turn people off because they leave their stuff around. They blow in, use everything up and leave."

Hackett uses a lot of local actors when he's casting.

"I like using real people," he said. The person responsible for casting will go to the mall.

"He'll sit at Twelve Oaks and approach people and ask them, 'Have you ever thought about being in a commercial? You look really interesting. I know the director and he'll be fun to work with.' Some people blow him off and some of them become stars," he said. Agencies also find people. Hackett will sit in on casting sessions and look at 50 actors before the final selection is made.

Most of the crew people in this type of business are freelancers. The lighting, makeup and crew all work for different production companies besides Hackett Productions.

"Our production company has a staff of five when we don't have a job," he said. "When we have a job, we hire a crew of about 45 people so they're working for us for two weeks."

Then there's the subdivision she lives in. She's in on the planning and planting around the entrance sign.

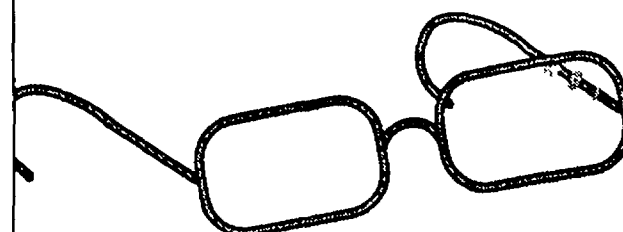
If you want to get into volunteer gardening in Northville, apply at Mill Race Village. Those who would like to join the Beautification Commission should contact the City Clerk's office.

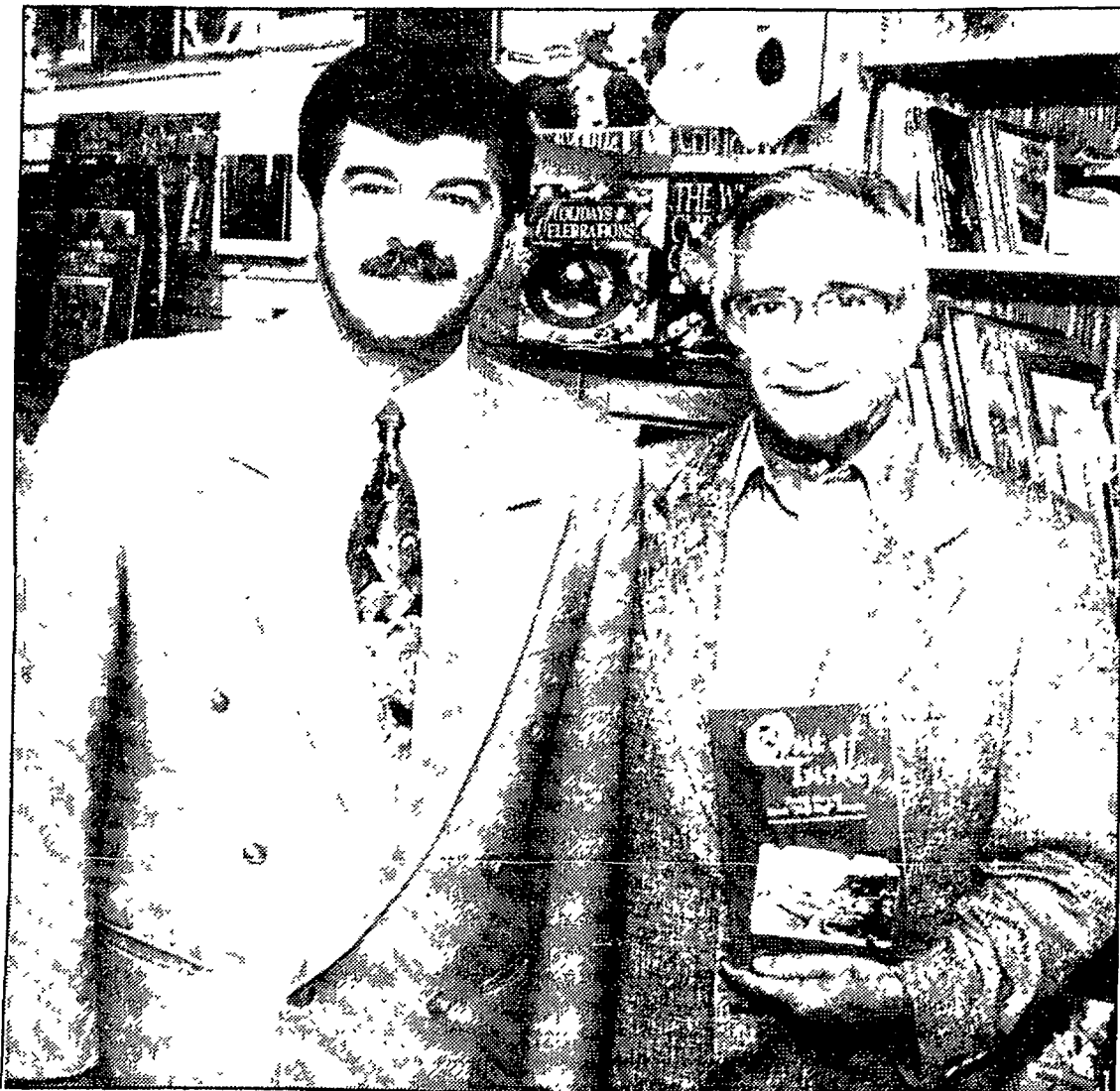

Family's heritage chronicled in book

Chuck Yessaian is a man on a mission - well, two missions. He has coordinated the publication of his Uncle's memoirs as a way to preserve the heritage he wants his grandchildren and great-grandchildren to remember.

The publication of the book *Out of Turkey* is also a fund-raising endeavor he has undertaken to help the children of Armenia through the Armenian Children's Relief Fund, of which he is a board member.

"We're hopeful people will like the book but it is more of an instrument to raise money and to have for the grandchildren and great-grandchildren to know why they have an 'ian' on the end of their names," said Yessaian.

Out of Turkey was written by Yessaian's uncle, Harry, who heard the stories when he was 13 from his oldest uncle, Nazar.

"Harry finally accumulated all the stories in his retirement and decided to write a book," explained Yessaian. "I told him I would help him publish it."

"The book is basically a true story. It's entertaining. It's fun. It's sad. It is very universal in an immigrant story. Most people of Eastern European descent that had a lot of problems like Armenians and Jews, that were dispersed all over the world, can relate to this book," Yessaian said. "This book opened the door to my ancestral past."

The book begins with the birth of Harry's father, Donik, a baby who entered the world demanding to be heard and who always had something to say as soon as he could talk. Although he was the youngest of five sons he was to lead the search for a better future for his family.

Dennis R. Papazian, Professor of History at the University of Michigan-Dearborn, worked on the book to verify its historical accuracy.

"The Armenian Children's Relief Fund raises money to assist the many war orphans we have in Armenia and Karabagh," said Yessaian.

"This book is a just another vehicle for raising money, a very small vehicle," said Yessaian. The book has also brought larger donations to the relief fund, which was established four years ago. The board members personally oversee that the donations go directly to the children. When an individual donates money to go to a specific item such as clothing, Yessaian will make sure those wishes are carried out.

"We take the money and exchange it into rubles. We buy in whatever market is available the goods that are available and disburse it to the people," explained Yessaian.

Yessaian is self employed as an investor and has lived in Northville for 16 years with his wife, Tulie, and their children, Georganna and Chuck.

Nancy works on a freelance basis as a stylist (wardrobe), with lighting and props and often works on commercials with Dan.

"The only disadvantage of working with her is doing meetings at 11 at night," said Dan.

He'll come in thinking he's all done for the day and I'll have the dining room table all laid out with things we have to make decisions on, said Nancy.

Northville has been chosen by Hackett as the site of other commercials. Last Christmas Hackett did a commercial for Arby's French Dip Sandwich and changed all the names (on the store fronts) to French names because it was supposed to be some place in France. "People in town were wondering

what was going on but they were real nice and receptive to it," said Nancy.

"Northville is cute and quaint and the people are friendly," Hackett said.

"Usually for a normal 30 second commercial you can shoot it in a day," he explained. "You get three or four commercials together so you end up shooting four or five days. The customer will pool them all together and shoot them all at the same time and save a little money."

That way they can alternate commercials and air some at a later date.

"If you watch TV and critique it in an evening you'll see that three quarters of it is just horrible and been done and then there's the stuff that emerges," Hackett said.

While Hackett was working at the Doner Agency for 17 years,

creative ideas could come anytime during the day. During the morning, a discussion of the latest movie might start creative ideas flowing. Ideas that came at lunch would be jotted down on a napkin. Late at night ideas were not always dependable, sometimes those were pitched the next morning and the process started over again.

"The pressure always makes something pop," said Hackett. "That's the one thing I miss," said Hackett of the four years he's been on his own. The transition wasn't that complex, said Hackett. "People thought I was crazy for giving up a partnership."

Hackett's first success came as a surprise in the fifth grade.

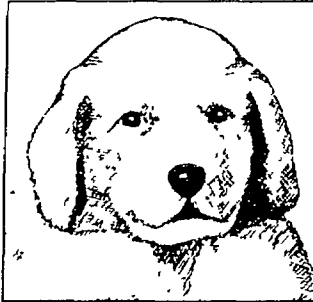
"I did a book report on birds and drew and hand lettered the whole thing. I wanted to get a good grade," he explained. The response he received was positive. He

remembered thinking "this is OK." Receiving more and more positive feedback for other projects led Hackett to consider writing and drawing seriously.

Hackett has worked with Tim Allen, Phil Hartman, Reba McIntyre, and a lot of the Tigers and Hall of Fame hockey players.

But such a glamorous life has disadvantages. Making lunch dates is difficult and doctors appointments become almost impossible. Hackett works for two weeks and then waits for the next job to come along. "It's a crazy schedule," he said.

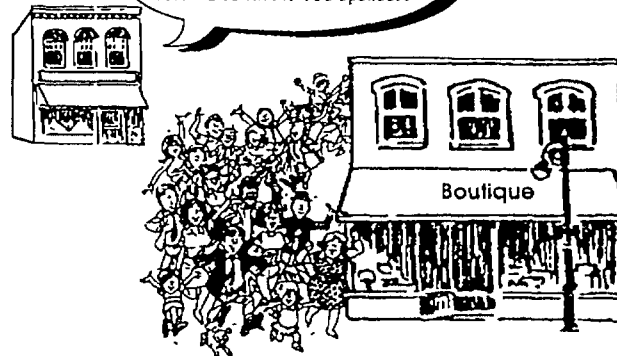

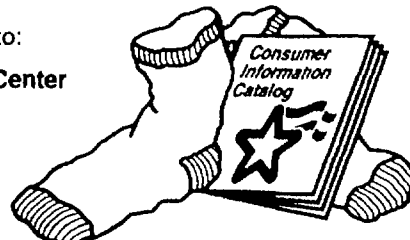

Cagers get win over Harrison with comeback

The Mustang basketball team's 64-61 win over Farmington Hills Harrison Thursday night falls into that category. Playing on the road, Northville High overcame an 11-point first quarter deficit to edge the Hawks.

Tankers finish second in WLAA

But the Mustang swim team did just that Saturday in taking second place at the conference meet. Northville tallied a batch of personal bests and qualified two relay teams for state finals.

"Some of the girls, for the first time, were stiff after they swam," said coach Bill Dicks. "That indicates that they went all-out."

Livonia Stevenson won the Western Lakes Activities Association championship with 641 points. Northville was a distant second with 440 1/2 points.

It was pretty much a forgone conclusion that the Spartans would win. Dicks said the real battle was with North Farmington for second place.

Northville beat out the Raiders by 46 points. Nearly half of those came in diving as the Mustangs out-pointed North Farmington 33-9.

"That was a huge difference," Dicks said.

Both the 200 and 400 freestyle relay teams qualified for the state meet, which will be held at Michigan State University in next week. Rebecca Anderson, Amy Kohl and Amity Heckemeyer have qualified for individual events.

Northville didn't make the cut in the 200-yard medley relay Saturday but was able to take third. Anderson, Gwen Osborne, Andrea Moretti and Katie Rompel finished in 1:58.83.

In the 200 freestyle, Kohl was fourth in the conference with a time of 2:01.8. Anderson was second in the 200 IM, Mandy VanHorn 14th in 2:28.87 and Kara Lyczak 15th in 2:30.05.

Northville had four placers in the 50-yard freestyle. Jodie Brown was third in 25.86, Tammy Cook fourth

in 25.96, Rompel 11th in 26.83 and Moretti 14th in 26.78. Each of the girls posted personal bests.

Karen Fischer finished sixth in diving with 331.8 points for 11 dives. Katrina Heckemeyer was eighth with 322.2, Michon Slanina 17th with 290.2 and Sarah Wright was 18th.

A time of 1:03.52 gave Anderson fourth in the 100-yard butterfly. Moretti finished 14th with her best time of 1:06.82. Beth Handley had a lifetime best for 18th at 1:12.62.

In the 100 freestyle, Amity Heckemeyer was second in 54.57, Tammy Cook was sixth in 58.03 and Brown was seventh in 57.45.

Amy Cook took second place in the 500 freestyle in 5:24.85. The 200-yard freestyle relay team of Tammy Cook, Brown, VanHorn and Amity Heckemeyer was first in the conference in 1:42.88. That beat the state mark by almost two seconds.

The 100-yard backstroke saw Amy Cook finish seventh in 1:05.06. Lyczak was 13th in 1:07, a drop of four seconds off her best time.

"She's worked hard all year," Dicks said of Lyczak.

Amity Heckemeyer won the 100-yard breaststroke in 1:09.86. Osborne was fifth with a lifetime best of 1:14.9, VanHorn was 12th in 1:18.52 and Jill Walro 13th in 1:17.55.

Tammy Cook, VanHorn, Kohl and Amity Heckemeyer made the state cut in the 400 freestyle relay in 3:50.26. That was good for second place in the WLAA.

"We got a lot of good performances," Dicks said. "We were shooting for second place and got it."

Hunting season opens Tuesday

Michigan's firearm deer season opens Tuesday.

Nearly 750,000 hunters are expected to trod through the woods in search of whitetails. According to DNR Big Game Specialist Ed Langenau, the deer herd is a little larger than what the state would like.

"It's at 1.6 to 1.8 million," he said. "We would like it to be smaller."

Most of the excess whitetails are to be found in the Upper Peninsula. Below the bridge, Langenau said, the herd is "just under what we'd like."

Firearm season runs through Nov. 30. Bow and arrow season started Oct. 1 and runs to January 1.

Langenau expects about 345,000 deer to be taken by hunters this season. Well over 200,000 of those will be bucks and the rest antlerless whitetails.

The DNR official said it's important that the state herd is trimmed. About 80,000 animals starved to death last year, Lange-

nau added.

"If we have an average winter," he said, "we'll have severe problems."

Getting a whitetail in the area isn't an easy task. Hunting in Novi and Northville is almost non-existent.

Firearm hunting isn't allowed at all in the city of Northville or in Northville Township. Township Director of Public Safety Chip Snider said. Bow and arrow hunting is permitted in the township, however.

In Novi some hunting has been allowed on private property in the northern end of the city. Novi Police Chief Doug Shaeffer was unavailable by press time Tuesday to clarify which, if any, areas in the city are still open to hunting.

Jim Beamish, a dispatcher with the Northville Township Police Department, said the best places to go hunting are up north.

"I usually go up the middle of the state to Clare County," he said.

The state divides Michigan into 13 hunting districts. District 10

Pancreas can be hurt by many diseases

The pancreas is a large gland located in front of the backbone behind the stomach. Because of its location, the pancreas cannot be felt by a physician so there is no simple way for it to be examined.

The gland is divided into two connected parts. First, the pancreas makes insulin in a

Most people do not know, however, what the pancreas is, where it is located or the basic diseases - diabetes, cancer and pancreatitis - that affect it.

small area called the islets of Langerhans. Second, the gland produces digestive juices that pass through a tube into the small intestine. These two functions are separate, but occur simultaneously within the pancreas.

Diabetes mellitus (sugar diabetes) is the most common disease that affects the organ. Although there are different factors such as drugs, genetics or viruses that can damage the insulin-producing part of the pancreas, it is damage to the islet cells that make the body incapable of producing insulin. Diabetes occurs when this happens. The severity of the disease depends on how much insulin is needed and produced by the body.

Pancreatitis is inflammation of the pancreas. The two most common causes of it are alcoholism and gallstones. Alcoholics are susceptible to episodes of intense abdominal pain, nausea and vomiting caused by alcohol-induced inflammation of the pancreas.

Usually these episodes are short-lived and

subside within a few days to a week. Some people, however, may suffer from frequent, long-lasting abdominal pain. In gallstone pancreatitis, the gallstones block the pancreatic digestive tube. This condition is easier to treat because the physician does not have to deal with the self-destructive behaviors that occur with alcoholism.

Cancer of the pancreas is the most feared of the pancreatic diseases. Because of its location and the fact that most cancers do not cause discomfort early on, pancreatic cancer is usually discovered only when the disease has advanced. If the tumor blocks the pancreatic duct, noticeable symptoms may occur early, giving a better prognosis for treatment and recovery.

effective exercise practices. The amount of exercise needed to improve fitness is frequently overestimated. Undue fatigue, muscle soreness and injury often result.

In rare instances, a life-threatening cardiac problem may occur.

The American Heart Association's committee on exercise has said, "For the sedentary individual, there is serious risk in the sudden, unregulated and injudicious use of strenuous exercise."

The caution appears to stem from three lines of evidence:

1. The risk of cardiovascular complications is transiently increased during vigorous exercise compared with that of other times. This

appears to be particularly true among persons with heart disease and those who are unaccustomed to exercise.

2. Sudden strenuous exertion may result in abnormalities in the heart's electrical waveform, signifying an inadequate oxygen supply or potentially dangerous rhythm disturbances.

3. An increase in blood clotting may occur with sporadic, high intensity exercise.

These recommendations will help those who plan to initiate an exercise program.

• **Check with your doctor if you plan to start a moderate intensity or strenuous exercise program.** Although an exercise test is not necessary for everyone, it is generally recommended for apparently healthy men older than 40 and women older than 50 or persons of any age with two or more major risk factors: high blood pressure, elevated cholesterol, cigarette smoker.

Also, persons who have — or have symptoms suggesting — heart, lung or metabolic diseases (e.g., diabetes) should have a medical evaluation that includes exercise testing before starting a vigorous exercise program.

• **Get the right equipment.** Plan to purchase a quality pair of gym shoes, warm-up suit, etc.

• **Obtain good supervision.** Supervised programs that offer competent exercise instructors

are important in reducing exercise complications.

• **Warm up before and cool down after, exercise — always.** Avoid strenuous exertion and abrupt cessation of vigorous exercise.

• **Start gradually.** If you plan to start jogging, start with a brisk walking program and gradually progress to slow jogging over several weeks.

• **Exercise regularly.** Don't try to cram all your exercise into one day per week, i.e. the weekend athlete.

• **Avoid high-intensity activity.** High-intensity activity may actually precipitate muscular or cardiac complications. As a general rule, the exercise should feel no more than "somewhat hard." The "talk test" is another simple way to determine if you are overdoing it — if you are unable to carry on a conversation during exercise comfortably, you probably are working too hard.

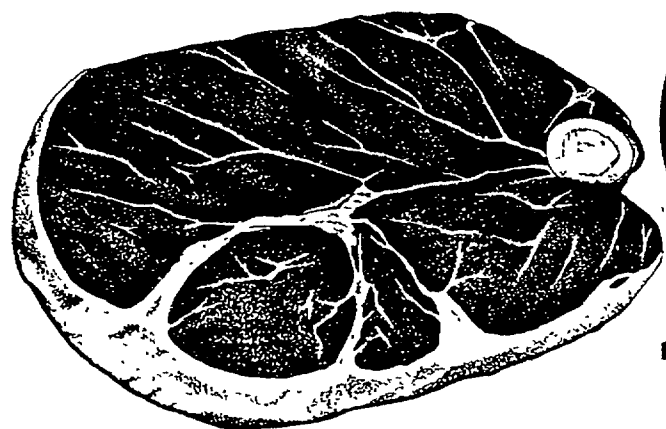

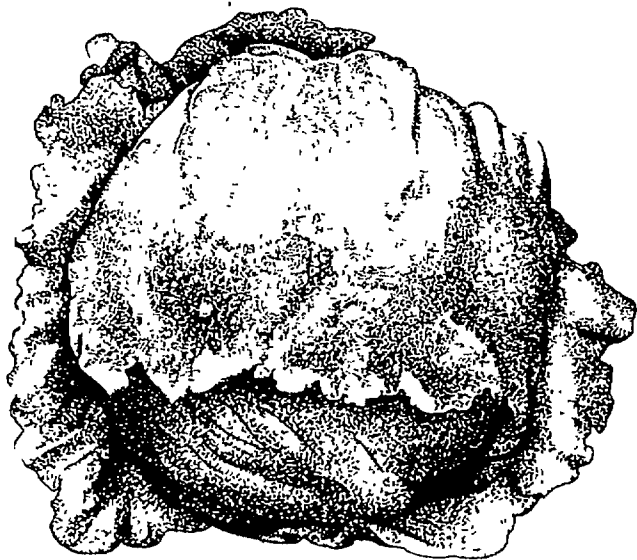

"I just told them, 'I'm so proud of you it's unbelievable,'" he commented. "They were ready to go and they did it."

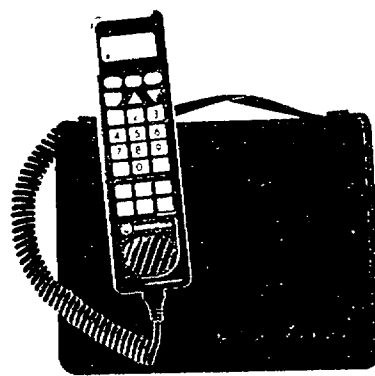
The coach said he also let up on the girls a little in practice.

A sleeping giant is awakening in the real estate investment market. It's loaded with money and anxious to acquire real properties, particularly office buildings and retail commercial properties.

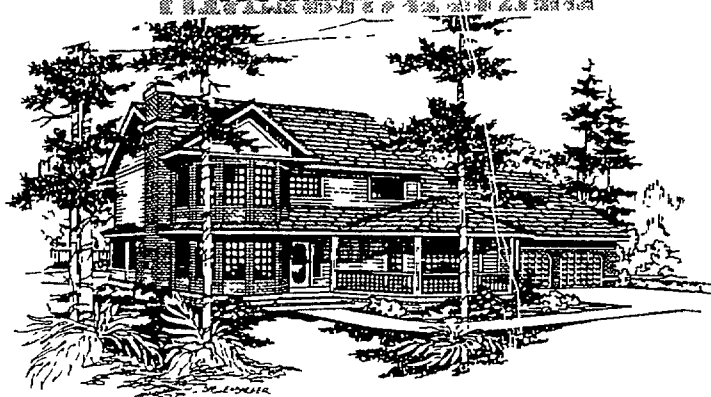
The giant investor is the pension fund reserve — many of them throughout the country. They're

The Redbud offers substance and grace

The first impression of the Redbud is one of substance and grace. Brick detailing and a traditional steep-pitched roof provide a sense of solid permanence, while rounded bay windows and a wraparound porch soften the lines and create a welcoming effect.

Octagonal windows nestled under the side gables add to the visual appeal. One of these windows brings some light into the side attic on the second floor. The other two are at opposite ends of a full attic on the third level. This undeveloped area could be developed, adding almost 1,000 square feet of usable space.

Family gathering spaces, formal and informal, dominate the main floor. The elegant master suite is here as well, its wide bay windows jutting out onto the shady porch. Features include a security system, his and hers walk-in closets, dual lavatories and a separately enclosed water closet and oversized shower.

Both the living room and dining room are richly glassed to maximize light, year-round. A tile-hearth fireplace provides additional warmth and color in winter.

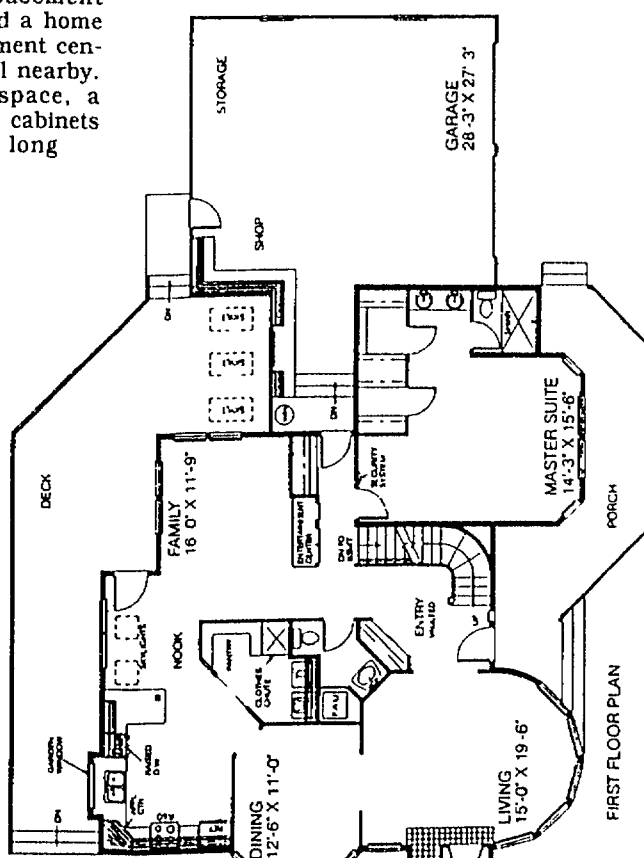
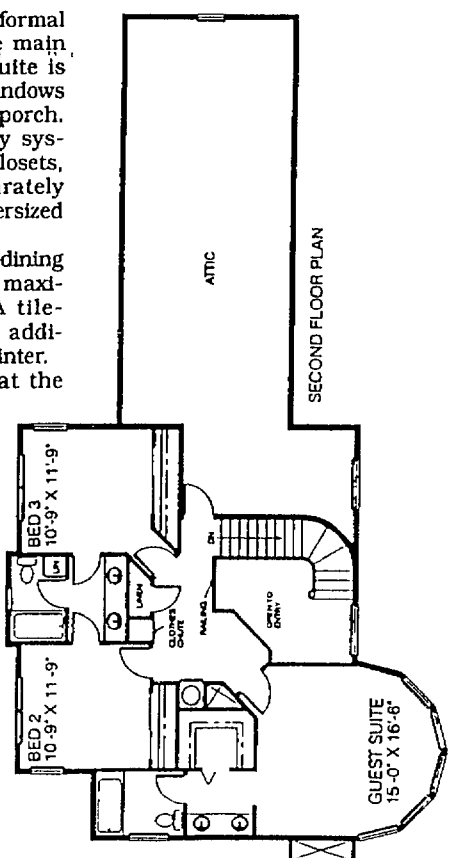
Daily living takes place at the back, where the kitchen, nook and family room flow together. This relaxed space is every bit as bright as the other rooms on the main floor. Standing at the kitchen sink, you gaze out at the deck through a garden window. In the nook, light streams down through skylights, and in the family room, windows fill most of two walls.

Kitchen conveniences include built-in appliances, a raised dishwasher and an appliance center. Utilities, a pantry, a small powder room, basement stairs and a home entertainment center are all nearby. Storage space, a shop with cabinets and a long

workbench expand the two-car garage.

On the second floor, a railing overlooks the wide foyer below. The guest suite is almost as large and as well outfitted as the master suite. If desired, a fireplace could be added here, as the chimney runs up next to the exterior wall. The other two bedrooms share a compartmentalized bathroom with a double vanity.

WINDOWS THAT ARE NOT A PANE

Replacing old, drafty windows is a good investment for homeowners, experts say, and the time to take care of it is now, before winter takes hold.

The year-after-year savings in heating and cooling costs, coupled with personal comfort, more than makes up for the initial investment.

As technology has evolved, so have windows, according to Chris Maas, window specialist at Church's Lumber in Brighton.

Most older windows are made of single panes of glass, and many don't seal well after years of use.

New windows are generally double-paned, and Maas recommends that consumers look for those with the "low E" designation.

"The low E is a metallic strip mounted on the inside of the window panels," Maas said. "In the winter, that strip reflects 80

percent of the heat that would normally escape right back into the house; in the summer, 80 percent of the heat that would normally come into the house is reflected back out."

That low E efficiency, coupled with the injection of argon gas between the two panes of glass, increases energy efficiency even more, said Bob Hicks of Acme Building Materials in Howell.

"Before the manufacturer seals the windows, the argon gas is injected in," Hicks said. "That gives the consumer a top-of-the-line window for energy efficiency."

And it helps the consumer save money, too.

Hicks said that the average homeowner can save between \$300 and \$500 annually in heating costs by replacing old windows.

"Exact savings for people depends on lots of things, like the size of the home and the square footage of glass," Hicks said. "But even if the house is full of glass, there will be a good savings."

The cost of new windows varies dramatically, depending on what materials are

used. The most economical, according to Maas, are the solid vinyl windows.

Windows are also available in wood or vinyl-clad wood. The vinyl-clad, Maas said, are much easier to care for than wood.

"With wood, you've got to paint every few years," Maas said. "With the vinyl-clad, you only have to wipe them down."

All three types of windows offer energy savings to the consumer.

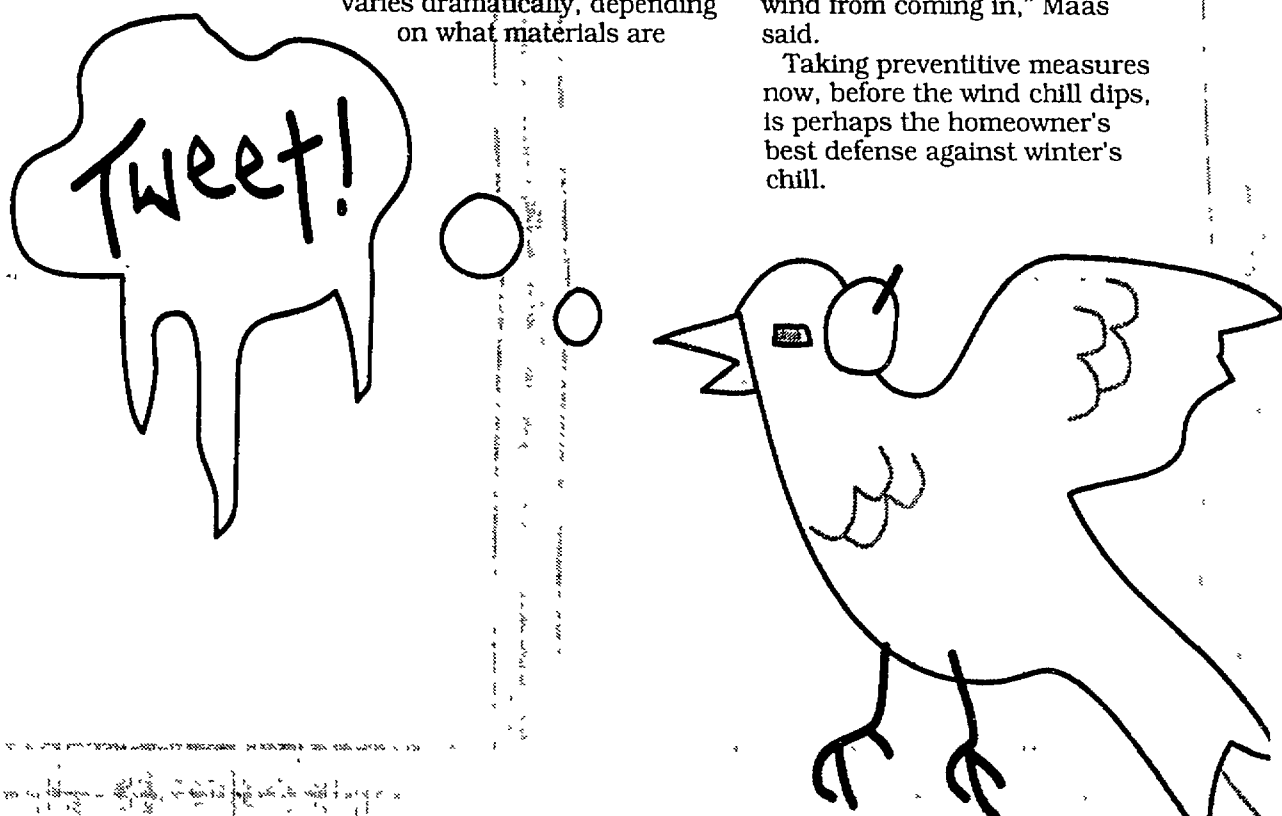
For those who absolutely can't afford to replace windows, Maas said that there are things that can be done by the homeowner to increase the energy efficiency of the old ones.

Places where cold air can come in and warm air can escape must be plugged, Maas said.

Short of putting plastic over the windows, the homeowner can use putty to seal the areas around panes, and insulation can be put between the window and the walls if the casement is removed and then replaced.

"The aim is to seal the window as much as possible to stop the wind from coming in," Maas said.

Taking preventive measures now, before the wind chill dips, is perhaps the homeowner's best defense against winter's chill.



Tangy vigorous rhubarb

Q. Will you please send me information on rhubarb plants and what should be done to make them grow vigorously. Thank you.

A. Rhubarb roots produce cuttings of tangy stalks one year after planting. In early spring, set out rhubarb roots 3 to 4 inches apart in well-prepared soil.

Don't ever eat the leaves of the rhubarb plant because they are toxic.

Q. I recently heard on the radio about salt hay to be placed around tomato plants. I called a number of nurseries and no one ever heard of salt hay.

What is it, what does it do and where can it be purchased?

A. You've asked a good question. Most people have no idea what "salt hay" is.

It's from salt marshes cut and dried the same way as ordinary hay.

It often is called marsh hay. It is used for covering plants in winter as protection.

You can buy or order it from dealers in horticultural supplies or nurserymen in your area, or collect your own if you live near the coast.

Q. I am writing to inquire if you know of a remedy to eradicate wild onions that I have a problem with in my back lawn. I have tried for several years but have not succeeded as yet.

Would appreciate any help you could give me on this condition.

No small children or animals are in the home to be worried about if poisonous.

A. I don't believe in using chemicals.

My suggestion would be to dig the wild onions out with a trowel. If that doesn't work, call your university extension service.

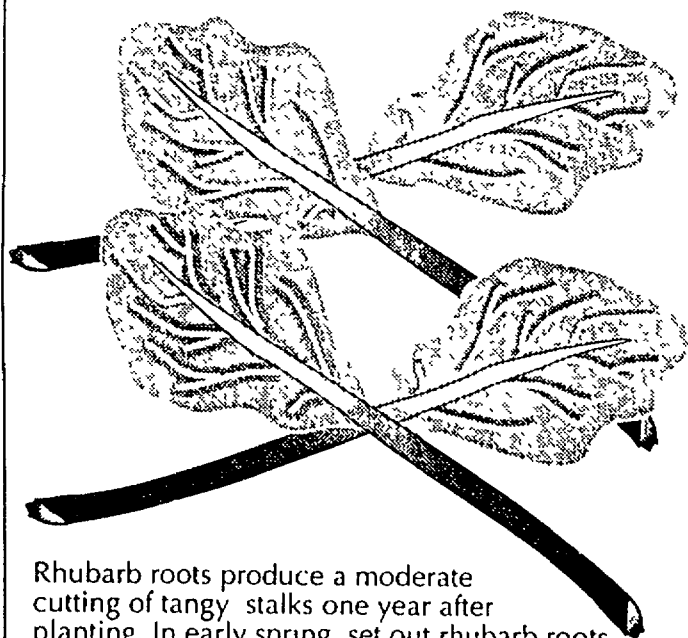

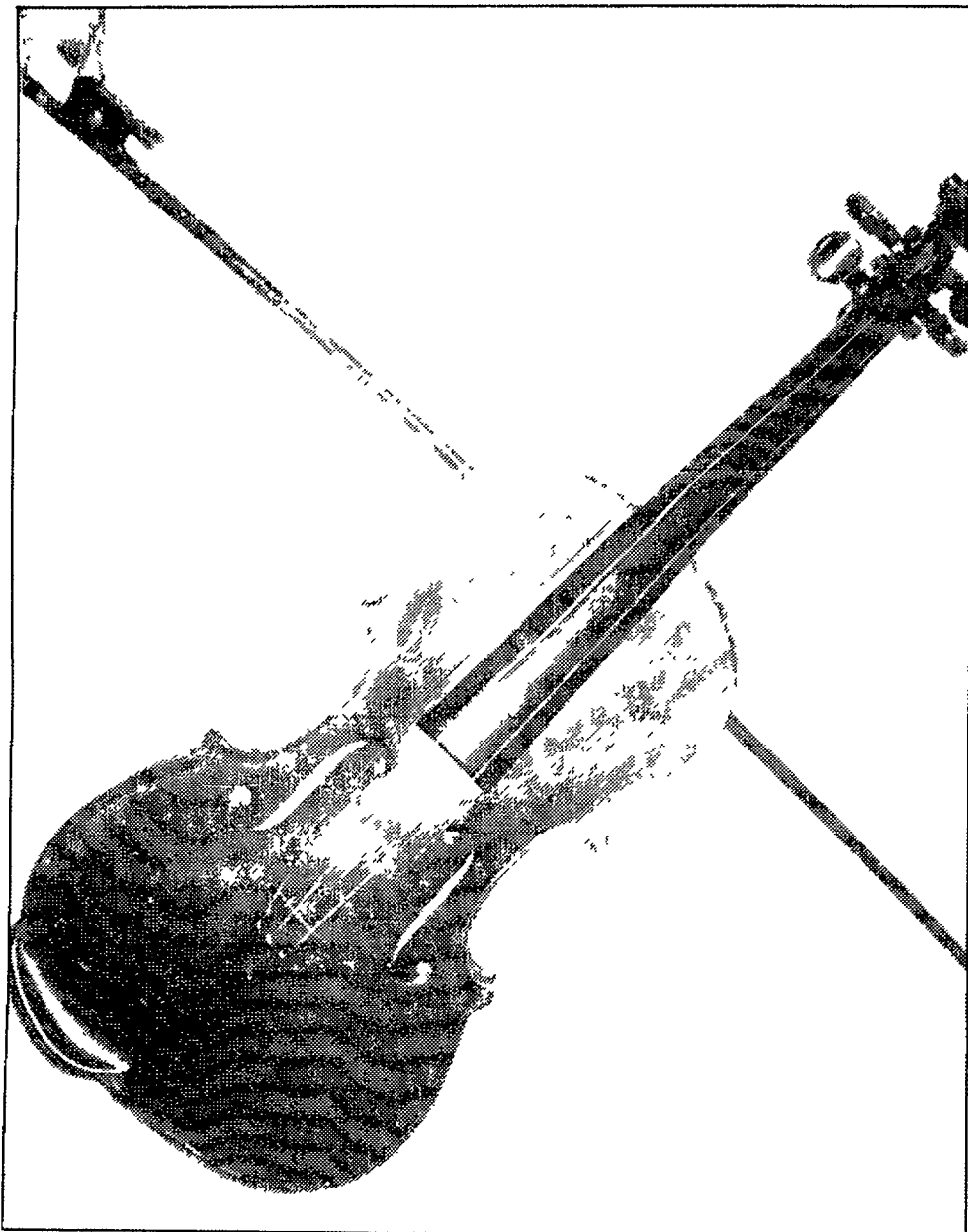

Old Stainer violin for a song?

Q: I have enclosed a picture of an old violin that has been in my family for several generations. Inside the violin are the words "Jacobus Stainer—1757."

Can you tell me anything about it?

Many were named after the famous violin makers Amati, Stradi-vari, Stainer and Guarneri. The Wall Street Journal reported, "Unfortunately, many violin companies have for centuries glued 'fake' Stradivari labels (as well as those of Guarneri, Amati, Stainer, and other revered makers) to their instrument, but just for show."

The instruments made by the famous violin makers have been accounted for; they are in the hands of collectors and museums. Your violin was made circa 1900. It would probably be worth about \$200 to \$225 in good condition.

Q: I have a Seder plate that has been in our family for many years. The plate is white with blue pictures depicting the complete Seder ritual. There are inscriptions in both Hebrew and English. At the top cen-

ter are the words "Service of the Passover." On the back are the words "Manufactured by Ridgways, England—699855."

Could you tell me how valuable my plate is?

A: Your Seder plate was made in Hanley, Staffordshire, England, by Ridgways. The number is the British registry number that shows it was made in 1923. The value of your plate would probably be about \$1,200 to \$1,500 in good condition.

Q: Enclosed is the mark on the back of two porcelain plates that belonged to my grandmother. She served me meals on them when I was a child more than 50 years ago. On one plate there is a picture of a frog riding a bike. On the other, a big frog is singing to a little frog. They are in perfect condition.

Could you please tell me how old these plates are and what their value

might be?

A: Your plates were made by Eplag in Pirkenhammer, Bohemia, now Brezova, Czech Republic. This firm was named Cplag in 1918 and later changed to Eplag. It existed until 1945. These plates were manufactured sometime around 1920 to 1930. Each plate would probably be worth about \$35 to \$50.

Q: I have a yellow-ware mixing bowl that is at least 100 years old. It is 13 by 16 inches. The color is buff and the outside has an embossed design.

What can you tell me about it?

A: Yellow-ware pottery was popular from the mid-19th century to the early 20th century. Its function was utilitarian and produced in both England and the United States. Yellow-ware differs from stoneware in that it is less dense and less impervious to water. This pottery could be found in a range of colors from buff to pumpkin yellow. Your bowl would probably be worth about \$100 to \$125 in good condition.

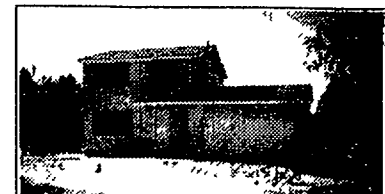

Pension funds pour into real estate; factory built homes

percent since 1982.

This is one of the fastest-growing sectors in our capital marketplace. And real estate has never looked better to pension fund managers and real estate advisers.

"Spurred by the dim return prospects for stocks and bonds and an apparent turnaround in property markets, pension fund money is flowing back into real estate," said Terry Williams, real estate reporter for Pensions & Investments.

His comment stemmed from responses received from P&I's recent survey of real estate advisers.

While pension fund managers used to consider real estate investments to be too risky, they are now seeking them. High-quality real estate and mortgage investments are given priority by an increasing number of fund managers and advisers.

The type of real property comprising the largest total investment, according to the survey, was office buildings, racking up 25.5 percent of total fund investments. Next in line were retail properties, 24 percent; multifamily housing

projects, 15.5 percent; industri-

al properties, 12.6 percent; hotels, 3.4 percent; single-family housing, 1.1 percent.

"This year, the institutional investment community has experienced a resurgence of interest in real estate," an article in Pensions & Investments stated. "Some of the largest investors have been pension funds that, like other investors, believe the real estate market has finally begun its long-awaited upswing."

The trend toward real estate investments by those awakening pension fund glants will not only result in more property sales, but will improve housing affordability and help keep interest rates low. It's a good news development for consumers and professional investors.

Q. What proportion of today's new homes are factory-built?

A. Surprisingly, 20 percent of all new houses in the United States are constructed entirely or partially in factories, according to a new book, "Manufactured Houses," published by Chicago-based Real Estate Education Co. Most people are surprised at that large proportion because they can't tell whether a house is a factory-built structure or a stick-built (conven-

tionally constructed) home.

The book points out that factory houses offer better design and construction than most conventionally built houses. Almost every style and size of home can be factory-built. And buying a manufactured home can save a lot of time and money, according to the

book's author, A.M. Watkins.

Q. Are home sales expected to increase during the rest of 1994?

A. Sales of existing single-family homes are expected to total about 3.95 million units for the year—up by 3.9 percent over last year's

sales, predicts the Research Department of the National Association of Realtors.

If that prediction materializes, this will be the second highest year in home sales since 1978 when home sales totaled 3.99 million units. The median price for a home this year is expected to be

\$110,600 That's 3.6 percent above the price for last year.

If you've got a hankering for more than just a typical fast food hamburger, Fuddruckers is the place to go.

Freshly ground beef and home-baked buns are trademarks of the Novi restaurant that lets you build your own hamburger. So pack on the pickles, tomatoes and onions to your heart's content - that's what Fuddruckers is all about.

"Whatever you want, as much as you want," adds General Manager Dan Andrews.

Fuddruckers originated in San Antonio, Texas in 1980. Daka International, which specializes in restaurant and hotel operations, purchased the business about three years ago.

The company now boasts restaurants throughout the United States and in Canada, Mexico, Saudi Arabia and Kuwait. Michigan's first Fuddruckers came on board in 1985 in Flint.

Andrews, who helped open that franchise store with the Antoniou family, said the company has been looking at Novi for several years.

"We've always heard it was one of the fastest growing cities in the state," he said, adding that the

community has continued to grow since Fuddruckers opened last July. "I've been amazed at how rapidly it has been booming."

Located at 43150 Grand River Avenue in the Novi Town Center, construction on Fuddruckers began in April. Andrews said everything went smoothly in getting the business going in the city.

"It went pretty well," he commented. "They've been cooperative and helpful in establishing (the restaurant)."

"We felt any location in this area would mature and develop into a location we could be proud of," Andrews said. "We feel we're getting in on the ground level."

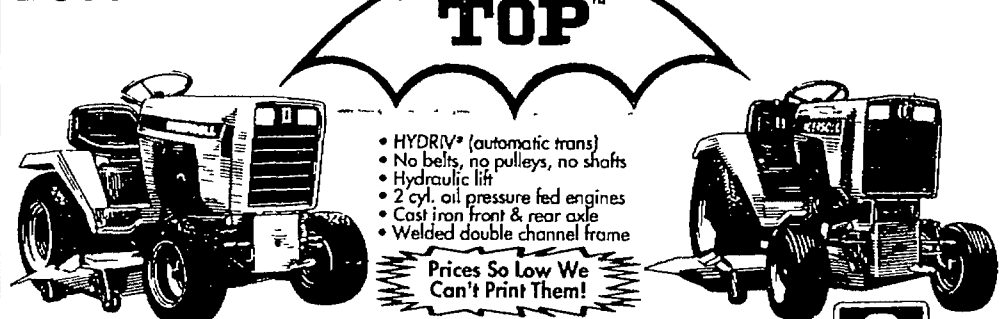
Customers, of course, will be the key ingredient in Fuddruckers success.

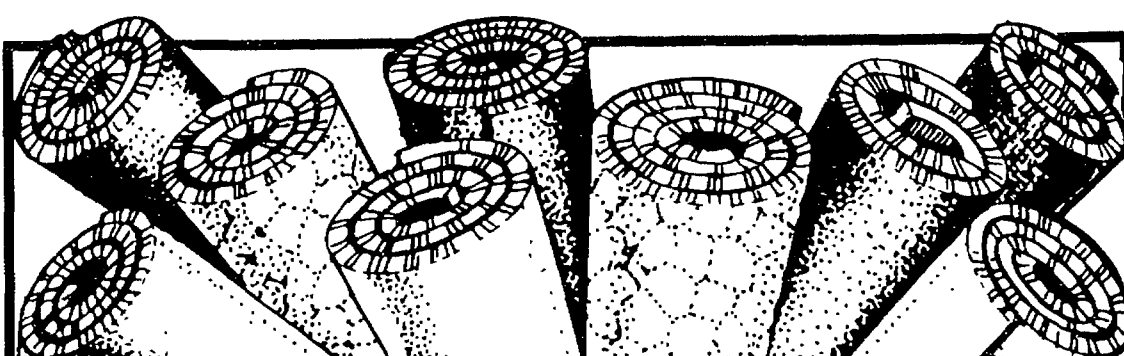

Take care with contributions

Making donations to charitable organizations may not stretch your purse strings as much as you may think.

The Michigan Association of Certified Public Accountants points out that as long as you itemize on your tax return, you can claim a tax deduction for your charitable contributions and lower your taxable income.

Suppose, for example, you make a donation of \$1,000 to a qualified organization. If you're in the 31 percent tax bracket, you may save up to \$310 in federal taxes. If you're in the 36 percent bracket, you may save up to \$360.

QUALIFIED ORGANIZATIONS

The MACPA points out that donating money directly to individuals, even if they are sick, disabled, or homeless, will not entitle you to a tax deduction. To claim a deduction, you must make your contribution to a qualified organization.

These include nonprofit religious, education or charitable groups such as churches, schools, hospitals, government agencies, veterans' groups, the Salvation Army and the United Way, as well as the Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts.

Money Management

For a complete list of qualified organizations, see IRS publication 78.

TYPE OF CONTRIBUTION

To obtain a deduction, you can donate more than cash. Gifts of property, such as furniture or an old car, can qualify for the deduction. Your write-off is equal to the fair market value of the property, which is the amount you would receive for the property today from a willing buyer.

Making gifts of appreciated property—such as stocks, real estate or antiques—can offer you additional tax benefits. When you donate capital gain property which you have owned for at least a year, you can deduct the fair market value of the property. What's more, your needn't pay taxes on the gains realized since you purchased the donated property.

For example, suppose you purchased some antiques for \$2,000 ten years ago and they are worth \$10,000 today. If you donated the

antiques to a local museum where they will be displayed, you can claim a tax deduction of \$10,000 and you needn't pay any tax on the \$8,000 gain.

DOCUMENT YOUR DONATIONS

Be sure to keep accurate records of all your charitable contributions including the name of the charitable organization, date and amount (of the fair market value) of your contribution. If you make a cash gift of \$250 or more, you generally must have a receipt from the recipient. Canceled checks are not sufficient proof of your donation. If you give property rather than cash, be sure the receipt adequately describes the donation.

If you donate property worth more than \$500 in a year to any organization, you'll need to complete additional paperwork: IRS Form 8283, Non-cash charitable contributions. The form is then submitted with your tax return.

For property donations exceeding \$5,000, you must have a writ-

ten appraisal from a qualified appraiser. A fully completed summary of the appraisal and an acknowledgement of the contribution from the recipient should be attached to your tax return. Keep in mind that the IRS may hit you with a penalty if you over value donated property.

LIMITS ON CONTRIBUTIONS

There are limits on your deductible charitable contributions that vary depending on the recipient of the contribution. Deductions for charitable gifts to public charities, such as schools, churches and hospitals cannot exceed 50 percent of your adjusted gross income (AGI). Gifts of appreciated property can't total more than 30 percent of your AGI. Gifts to veterans' groups are limited to 30 percent of your AGI, with a further limit of 20 percent of AGI for certain appreciated property.

You may, however, carry over deductions in excess of these amounts for five years. Additional rules apply, so check with your CPA before making any large contributions.

Steak, chicken and fish sandwiches are also made. Specialty salads, such as the taco, chicken Hawaiian and Caesar chicken, are made fresh daily as well.

But let's talk burgers. Fresh chuck is ground twice and formed into a perfect patty in Fuddruckers' "Butcher Shop." From there it's grilled to the customer's specifications.

The burger is then put into a fresh bun that more closely resembles a baker's roll than the hockey puck served at most fast food places. A trip to the "Pile-it-On" produce bar allows patrons to customize their hamburgers.

"You have total control over your food here," said Andrews.

A pleasant dining atmosphere adds to the meal. Real tables and chairs, video games and neon signs make it fun, too.

"It's an atmosphere where people can come in from cutoffs to tuxedos," said Andrews. "It suits everyone's fancy."

Homemade, chocolate chip and oatmeal raisin cookies are around

to satisfy every sweet tooth. Hand-dipped milk shakes and ice cream sundaes are sure to be kid favorites. Adults can enjoy wine, beer and frozen "daiquiritas."

"It takes a lot of work to get it all together," Andrews said. "We're here at 7:30 a.m. cutting, grinding and baking to serve that first burger at 11."

communities using ozone to their drinking water."

If you use a conventional salt system and have an iron problem, you have to purchase yet another separate filter system that requires addition chemicals such as potassium permanganate. Ozone is also nature's most powerful oxidizer, easily oxidizing heavy metals and converting iron from soluble to a solid which is then simply removed and discharged.

Chemicals that have been used to try to clean our water with conventional systems are discharged into our septic fields where they do not effectively break down before eventually reaching our water table. In turn, it is drawn from our wells and, in essence, we are devastating our water table and polluting our own drinking water, said Wood.

"We need to examine the elimination of chemicals, salts and polluting carcinogens like chlorine from our drinking water instead of generating different kinds of salt like potassium chloride (K-Life) to use."

The world's largest Ozone generator used for water treatment plan has been used by the Los Angeles City Department of Water since 1991 to solve the contamination problems in city water. Los Angeles' water previously was contaminated with toxins and sol-

vents, but the use of Ozone is helping to effectively meet their water purification needs. California is also in the process of passing legislation to curb the use of salts, said Wood.

Wood also noted that Ozonation has been used to sanitize the water system in Nies, France, for over 70 years. Closer to home, Ann Arbor is currently building an ozone generator for its water system.

In addition to residential applications, Bramwell Environmental also services industrial laundry services. Marathon Laundry in Detroit, for example, has incorporated Ozone to get clothes cleaner with 75 percent less detergent.

Ozonation can also be used as an alternative for chlorine in swimming

pools and cooling towers because these water facilities are also plagued by micro-organisms, said Wood. Unlike chlorine, ozone disinfects the pool water, not the bather. Cooling towers are renowned for fouling from large deposits of iron and scale. With ozone oxidizing power, both micro-organisms and heavy metals are neutralized and controlled.

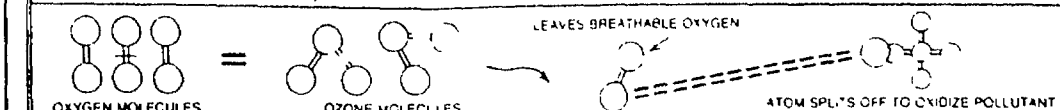
Wood has been involved in filtration and pipe processing systems for over 18 years. The majority of his experience was gained at UpJohn Chemicals in Texas where he was on a research and development team in the plant and laboratory. He has also worked for Filtra Systems in Wixom.

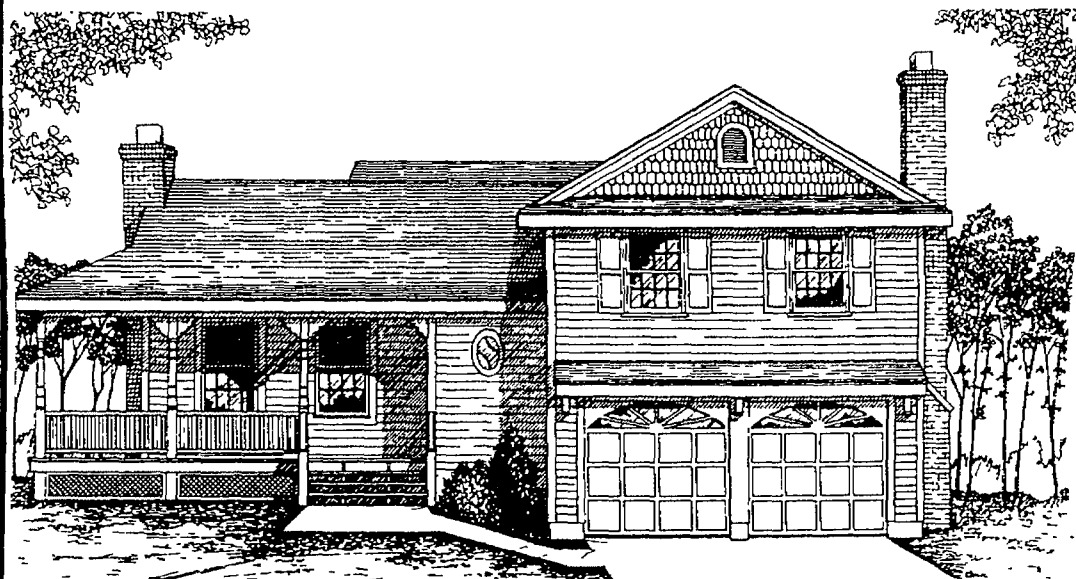
Wood stated that after seeing large industrial companies take advantage of Ozone, he could not help but get excited with the idea of offering homeowners a good salt-free Ozone system in place of conventional water treatment systems. "That was the motivating drive that led to the formation of Bramwell Environmental," he said. "What's exciting is that the system makes the process of cooking, drinking and cleaning eating, safe and more rewarding than ever before," he said.
