

## Public hearing date set for Ward proposal

Is the third time really a charm? When it comes to Ward Church and its plans for the corner of Six and Haggerty, a lot of folks hope so.

The latest development plan for the 139 acres the church owns there went before Northville Township's planning commission on Tuesday. Residents can have their say about the proposal when the commis-

sion holds a public hearing on it next month.

Since 1987, Ward and the township have spent a lot of time and money trying to agree on a plan for the site. The church - now located at Five Mile and Farmington Roads in Livonia - wants to build a new, bigger facility there. It has received township approval for development proposals twice before, but didn't move forward on them. Instead, the time limit on the

approvals expired, moving everything back to square one.

Earlier this year, Ward - teaming up with Farmington Hills developer Gary Sakwa - tried again. They floated a new and ambitious plan with township officials: combining the church and a huge commercial shopping center into one plan under the township's Haggerty Planned Unit Development (HPUD) option.

It was a version of that conceptual plan

- one which has undergone major changes since first presented to the commission in February - which the commission took a look at this week. After much discussion, the members of the commission agreed to hold a public hearing on the plan on Jan. 17.

They also gave Ward and Sakwa an extensive list of requests for new or updated information on several aspects of the HPUD plan. The commissioners said

they'd want to see the data ready for the upcoming hearing.

While some members of the commission voiced concerns about it, none can deny that the plan is grand in size. Included in it are the 240,000 square foot Ward Church (built in two phases), 300,000 square feet of shopping space and 4,800 parking spaces. A loop road would circle

## Main Street shocker: Crawfords' closes

Instead of being greeted with the warm, tantalizing aromas that normally fill Crawfords' Bakery Connection, residents who stopped by the Main Street shop this week were stunned to find the words "Closed Permanently" on the door.

Last Saturday at 5 p.m., Sue Poster, owner of the popular bakery at 123 E. Main St., turned off the lights and shut the door for good.

The windows of the store are

now covered with newsprint and the closed sign, written in large blue letters on the door, stunned the store's numerous devoted customers and even its employees.

"I admit I took the chicken's way out," said Poster, who did not inform her employees or even her children of her plans to close the store until Saturday evening. "I thought about giving notice, but mentally I couldn't handle it. I've practically been in tears for the past couple of days."

Poster, who has owned and

operated the bakery for five-and-a-half years, said the job got to be too much of a burden to handle.

She was working 18-hour days and juggling all aspects of the business, including, baking, bookkeeping, inventory, ordering and buying supplies and maintenance. In addition to the culinary treats the store offered, Poster also catered parties and weddings, a job that turned out to be exhaustive, she said.

"I'm not a business person, I'm a baker," she said. "I was wearing

too many hats. Physically and mentally, it got to be too much."

Poster's family owned and operated Crawfords' restaurant, 160 E. Main St., from 1984 until they sold the business last March.

The absence of constant family support right across the street also factored into Poster's decision to call it quits, she said.

"When we owned the restaurant, I had a lot of family support around," she said. "But once we sold it, the fun went out of it and

## DNR eyes area 15 local sites named to possible cleanup list

Several Northville locations have made the Michigan Department of Natural Resources' (MDNR) proposed list of environmentally contaminated sites in the state, and one ranked as among the worst.

State law requires the MDNR each year to compile a list of contaminated locales and submit it to the state Legislature. The list is prepared pursuant to the conditions of the Michigan Environmental Response Act (MERA), passed in 1982. MDNR officials and state lawmakers use the list to make decisions about the priority of sites: which ones get a slice of the limited monetary pie for evaluation and cleanup.

This year's proposed list will apply for fiscal year 1996. It will be finalized this March. The MDNR list now includes 10,009 sites in Michigan. The total represents a six percent increase over last year's final list of 9,439.

Of the 10,009 locations, some 7,170 are classed as leaking underground storage tanks, "LUST sites," in MDNR vernacular. Wayne County leads all counties with a combined total of 1,350 LUST and non-LUST sites.

In Northville, 13 sites made the LUST list and two the non-LUST list.

The majority of the sites on the LUST list, MDNR officials said, involve petroleum products. The two Northville non-LUST locations are cited for a number of hazardous chemical compounds.

## Schools prep for new contract talks

Northville Public Schools officials have already started to put their heads together to discuss upcoming negotiations with employees, as contracts with the district's seven bargaining groups are due to expire this summer.

Historically, discussions on employee contracts have not started until later in the year. But due to several factors, including this

year's revamped funding of schools and upcoming changes from Lansing in core curriculum standards, Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski said it was wise to get an early start.

"There are an awful lot of things coming from the state and from programs we have initiated like the restructured high school day that could affect contracts," Rezmierski said. "So we needed to get a jump start on this."

Northville Board of Education members voted to go into executive session to discuss upcoming contracts at their Nov. 21 meeting at Winchester Elementary school and again on Nov. 28 at a special meeting.

This school year, officials will have to ink new contracts with seven different groups of employees, including teachers, adminis-

## Police News

## Police get suspect in church B&amp;E's

A 15-year-old boy has confessed to Northville City Police that he was responsible for two break-ins at the First Presbyterian Church, 200 E. Main St., and another break-in at Genitus Hole-In-The-Wall Restaurant, 108 E. Main St.

The boy was charged with the offenses and city police have filed a petition complaint with Wayne County Juvenile Court.

Sergeant Dave Fendelet said he also expects to charge a 19-year-old Northville man who was an accomplice in at least one of the break-ins at the church.

Police were able to recover the television, VCR, two stereo speakers and a computer, including the terminal and keyboard, that were stolen from the church. A compact disc player that was also stolen was not recovered.

On Oct. 24, the church suffered its first break-in after an employee discovered several of the offices in

the building had been ransacked and \$400 in stereo and television equipment had been stolen.

Also on Oct. 24 Genitus's had several cases of empty beer bottles stolen. Nothing else from the restaurant was missing.

The next day, an employee at the Liquor Shoppe, located across the street from the restaurant, reported to police that several teenage boys attempted to return numerous garbage bags of beer bottles.

Then, on Nov. 16, the First Presbyterian Church suffered another break-in that resulted in a loss of a \$1,720 computer.

**LARCENY FROM A BUILDING:** A resident of Canterbury Lane reported to Northville City Police that a \$460 snow blower was stolen from his garage Nov. 22.

The resident told police that the garage is often left unlocked. However, he was not sure if it was left

open the night the equipment was stolen.

Police have no suspects or witnesses at this time.

**SMOKING ON SCHOOL GROUNDS:** Northville City Police cited two Northville High School students with smoking on school grounds.

At Principal Tom Johnson's request, city police have started to enforce the no-smoking rule at the high school.

A 15-year-old male student was cited after he was caught smoking Nov. 23 and was referred to juvenile court in Oakland County.

A 17-year-old student was also caught by a faculty member Nov. 18 in the boys' locker room.

The student denied he had been smoking. The faculty member said he saw the boy exhale smoke.

A court date has been set for Dec. 16.

**SKATEBOARDING IN PROHIBITED AREA:** A 13-year-old boy and two 16-year-old boys were caught skateboarding only 20 feet from a "No Skateboarding" sign at the parking deck on Cady Street.

When a Northville City Police officer approached the boys and asked them if they were aware of the sign, the boys walked up to it in a mocking fashion, read it and then told the officer they had not seen it before.

The officer confiscated the skateboards and wrote the 16-year-old boys a citation.

The 13-year-old was referred to juvenile court.

**LARCENY OF A BIKE:** A \$350 men's mountain bike was stolen after it was left unlocked in the bike rack in downtown Northville.

## Library program offers opportunity to give gift books

The Give a Book program is unique because the service it provides goes directly into the community, Orr said.

## OCC board seeks 1 mill tax

For the second time, George Mosher is embarking on a major countywide tax campaign for Oakland Community College, this time with an asset he lacked in 1964.

"Thirty years ago we had no friends," said the Birmingham attorney who was a founding board member of OCC in the 1960s and '70s. In 1995, OCC will have seen a total of 300,000 students in its classrooms, and 118,000 still live in Oakland County.

"We're going to get out our friends to vote and let the rest go," Mosher told trustees over a light dinner recently. The mail, telephone and speech campaign aimed at getting students, former students, families and friends of students to vote yes March 16.

"Nearly everyone in the county has had some contacts with this college. They've had a favorable experience. I've had (campaign) volunteers contact me which is a little unusual when you're trying to raise taxes," he said.

Minutes later the board of trustees voted 7-0 to place a one-mill property tax increase on the ballot. The date was a day earlier than previous discussions had indicated. All voters in the OCC district will be eligible to vote.

"Raising taxes is something I've always been against," Mosher said. "But the college needs additional millage, and the college has earned it. It's not hard for me to enter on this campaign with vigor."

"I was pleased to see Wayne County Community College got its mill through (a renewal) in the last election," he said.

In the 1960s and '70s, voters gave OCC one mill to operate, and the board was able to levy an additional 0.7 mill for construction bonds.

Today the operating millage has shrunk to 0.68 mill under the constitutional tax-limitation amendment. The construction bonds have long been paid off. Since no new campuses or buildings are planned, the new request is for all-purpose millage.

Specifically, said OCC Chancellor Patsy Fulton, the new money will go for equipment, maintenance, expansion of technology programs, beefing up of scholarship funds and computers.

"We have 18 programs with no full-time faculty," Fulton told the board. She reported on a meeting with state legislators who gave her the discouraging news that community colleges could expect no new money. The new K-12 school bill and prisons are soaking up money from the rest of the general

fund, they told her.

"OCC receives the lowest amount of state aid per FTE (full-time equivalent) student - \$983. The state average is \$1,084, so we get a bit more than half the state average. The top receiving college gets \$4,026. We get less than one-quarter of that," she said.

Twenty years ago, state aid was nearly 41 percent of OCC's budget; this year it is 24 percent. Property taxes were 37 percent then and 36 percent now. The shrinking of state aid has been replaced by a heavier reliance on student tuition and fees - 21 percent 20 years ago, 38 percent this year.

Trustee Sandra Ritter of Waterford said she opposed the millage idea last June but changed her mind because "I got the information I needed - clear, concise and to the point. I can agree we certainly need the millage."

"If voters are given the facts," added trustee Douglas Wakefield of Southfield, "they'll see the need."

Jo Prescott, a spokesperson for the 230-member AFSCME Local 2042, announced support of the ballot proposal.

The OCC Faculty Association, bargaining agent for the faculty, presented a \$540 check from political science instructors for the campaign.

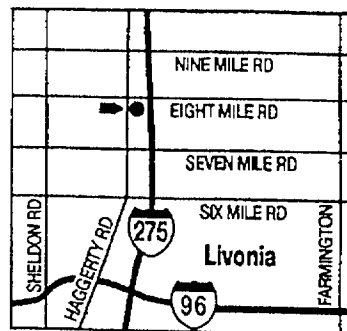

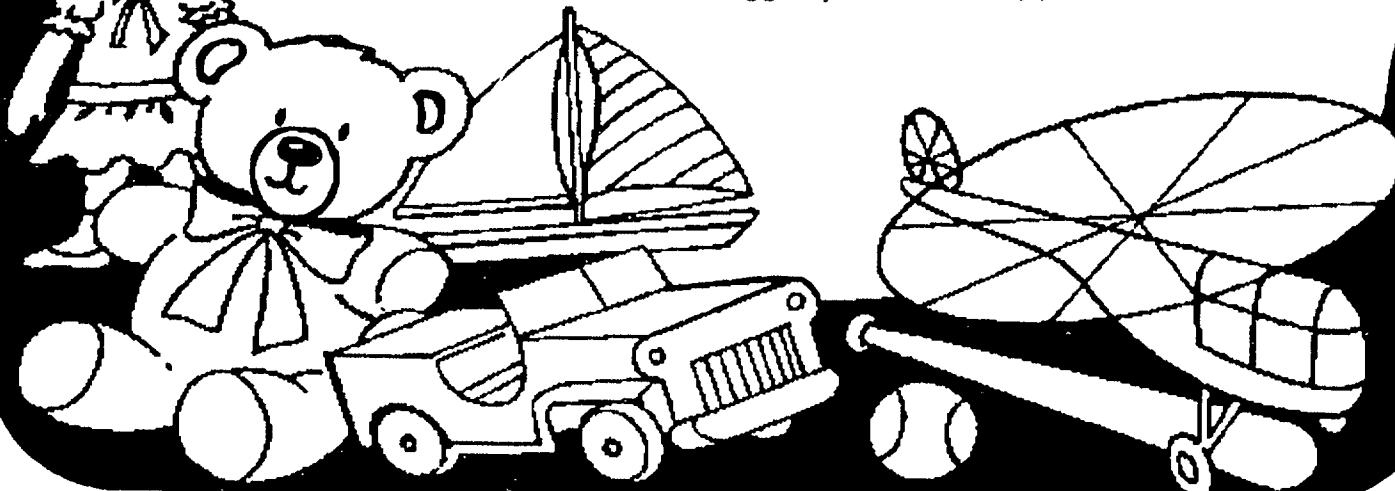

# Richard Fletcher, hospital official, dies unexpectedly

Staff members of Northville Regional Psychiatric Hospital are in shock and mourning over the passing of the institution's administrative officer, 59-year-old Richard Fletcher.

Mr. Fletcher died suddenly of a heart attack Sunday, Nov. 20, at Annapolis Hospital in Wayne.

"He was a very good professional and a very kind person," said Northville Regional director and chief executive officer Dr. Walter Brown. "We were very well liked by the whole staff here."

Dr. Brown said hospital employees are planning a private memorial service on Dec. 5 to remember their late colleague.

According to Dr. Brown, Mr. Fletcher oversaw budgetary and financial affairs for Northville Regional. He served in that capacity at the hospital for 10 years. He worked in the state Auditor General's office prior to his position with the Northville Township facility.

Mr. Fletcher's death is one in a

series of recent tragedies at the hospital - it was the fourth death by heart attack among Northville Regional staff in the past year, Dr. Brown said.

"These are stressful jobs. That may not be the entire explanation, but I think that's at least part of it."

Other prominent local health care officials who died unexpectedly this year include Dr. Harold Lockett, the director of Hawthorn Center, and Peter Radakovic, the owner of the Star Manor retirement home.

Mr. Fletcher, who lived in Westland, is survived by his wife, Caroline, and by his two children, Richard and Sabrina. Also surviving are a brother and sister and four grandchildren.

# Township channels funds into demolition project

Most everyone who's driven down Beck Road south of Six Mile has noticed a massive old water tank. The unsightly gray stone monolith sticks out like a sore thumb and is hard to miss.

Not for long, however, if Wayne County and U.S. government officials approve a Northville Township plan to demolish the structure.

The township's board of trustees at a Nov. 17 meeting voted in favor of "reprogramming" \$51,000 in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) monies. The cash, given to the township by the federal government, will be used to tear the tank down and seed the land for green space.

A legacy of the Detroit Water & Sewer department, the tank is empty and hasn't been used for some time. Moreover, it can't be used for water storage any longer and nothing in township ordinance covers its possible uses, CDBG coordinator Maureen Oisecki told the board.

The feds give local communities CDBG monies to use in a variety of

community improvement projects, such as loans to low-income people to fix up their homes. The problem, Oisecki explained, is that there just aren't enough projects in the township on which to use all the grant monies.

Some of the cash has been on hold for years and county and federal officials have said the township will lose it if they don't use it. That led to Treasurer Rick Engelland and Oisecki working on a list of alternative projects that federal rules would allow the money to be used for.

"We had a list of about 8-10 items, which we whittled down to this one, which we felt was the most likely to get approved," Engelland said.

The notion of using the tank for

storage, Oisecki said, isn't an economical one. A number of costly improvements would be needed, including an entryway, Oisecki said.

The tank's removal comes under the heading of eliminating "spot blight," she explained.

The \$51,000 "may not be quite enough" to complete the project, she estimated, but added that it would make sense for the board to agree to kick in any extra dollars for the demolition that may be needed. Removing the tank would benefit the township, Oisecki said.

The idea has gotten preliminary approval from county and federal officials, Oisecki said, but now it will be submitted for formal approval.

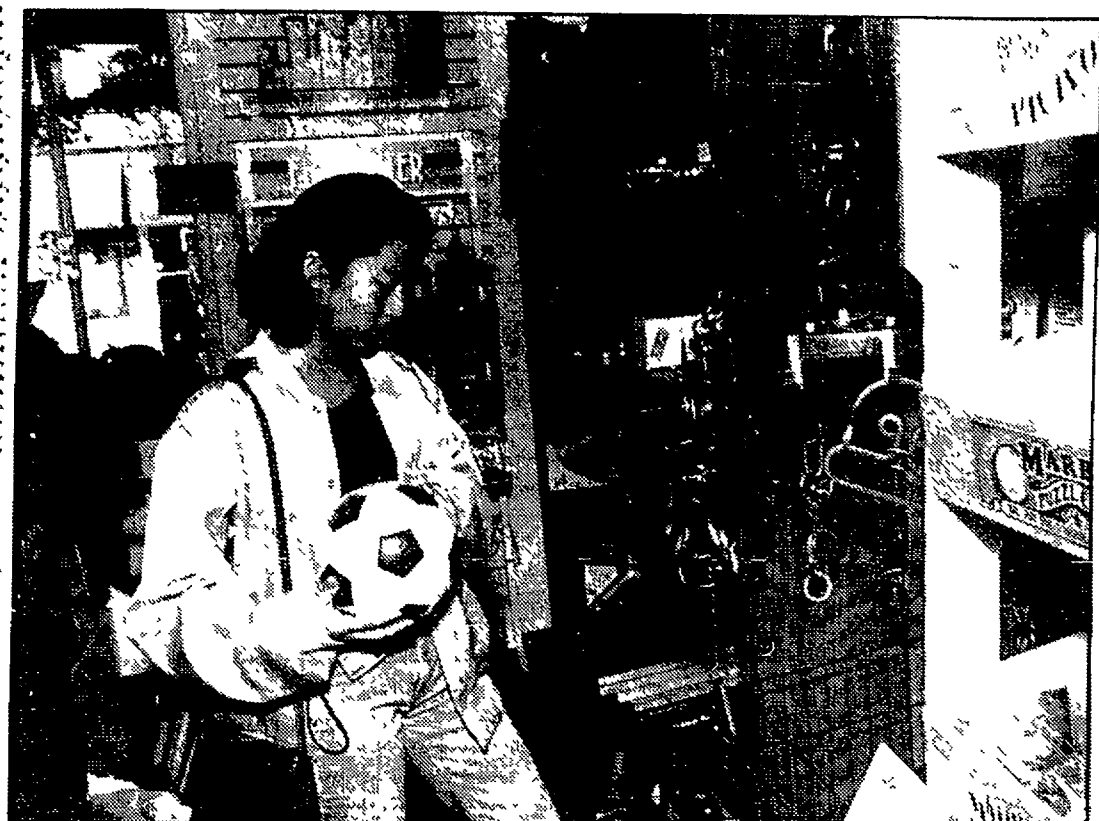

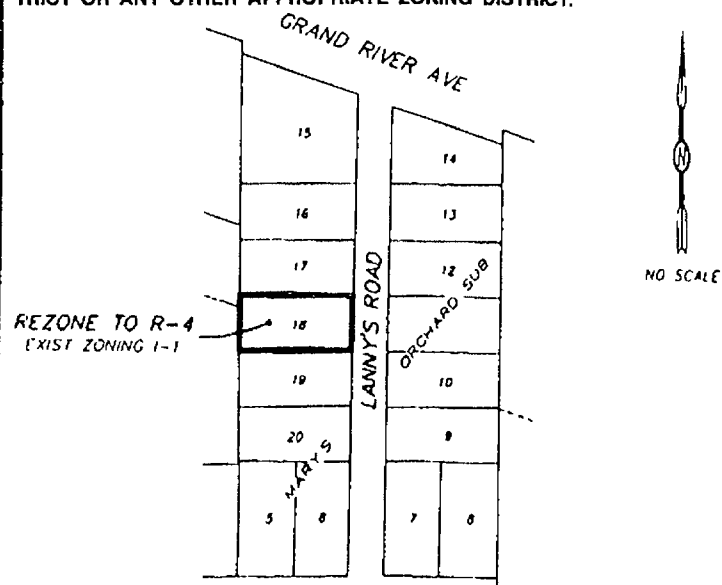

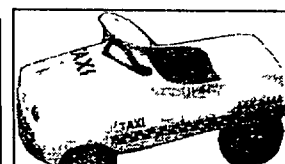

# MS patient combats disorder with courage

When Doris Colling was first diagnosed with multiple sclerosis nine years ago, her doctor told her her options were limited.

"I asked my doctor if there were any special diets, vitamins or exercises I could do," said Colling, a Northville resident who lives in Blue Heron Pointe. "No," he told me. "Just let the disease take its course."

And for a number of years, Colling did just that, trying to come to terms with the fact that she had the debilitating disease.

"I was such an active person, I could never visualize myself being handicapped," she said. "Then all of a sudden you are one of those other people. It is a blow to your self esteem to have a debilitating disease."

MS is a disease of the central nervous system that attacks the myelin, the protective coating surrounding the nerves, and inhibits the brain's ability to send messages to various parts of the body.

There is no cure for the chronic disease, which affects each person differently and at varying degrees. The ailment eventually leads to paralysis in most people.

After a number of years of dealing with the disease, Colling, 61, thought there must be more she could do.

"After about five years, I thought, 'This doesn't make any sense, it's just stupid,'" she said.

Once she made up her mind, the optimistic Colling set down a path that would help change the lives of many people living with MS in the metro-Detroit area.

Colling made some phone calls to experts and representatives from the local chapter of the Multi-

ple Sclerosis Society. But instead of joining a support group, she decided to start her own.

A little more than a year after Colling began her group with about eight members in the fall of 1993, Group Exercise for Multiple Sclerosis (GEMS) has now grown to more than 45 members and is the only MS group in Michigan that offers a weekly aquatic exercise class.

"Water exercise is really the only exercise MS people can do," Colling said. "They can't stand the heat."

Colling likens the phenomenon of MS to that of a lamp with an electrical cord that has frayed. If the cord, like the nerves of the body, is damaged, the lamp will not work.

"When I got MS I said to myself, 'I'll be different. I will be able to move my legs,'" she said. Colling demonstrates as she looks at her left leg and tries, unsuccessfully, to lift it. "See, it just doesn't get the message."

In addition to the group's weekly water aerobics class each Friday at the YMCA in Livonia, the members hold a support meeting after exercising.

The buoyancy of the water gives people with MS more flexibility and movement of muscles. As Colling gets into the pool before class, she demonstrates her ability to lift her left leg in the water.

GEMS member Norma Koroian said the pool exercise has been wonderful for her.

"Head to toe, you get to use all your muscles," Koroian said. "It helps a lot to get use of all your body."

Last month the group received a \$4,271 grant from the United Service Association for Health Care

Foundation, a group that donates millions of dollars each year to causes like GEMS.

The grant, which was written with help from the staff at St. Mary's Hospital in Livonia, will go to purchase a device called a "lift," a mechanical chair that will help lower GEMS members into the pool.

Colling raised about \$1,500 for the lift, which costs about \$2,700. A portion of the grant will pay the remainder of the price. The rest of the grant will go toward flotation devices and weights.

Currently, the YMCA uses a set of plastic, portable steps to help ease exercisers in the pool. However, for many members who have lost a considerable amount of control of their limbs, it is still difficult, and often frightening, to enter the pool.

Colling, who is reluctant to take credit for the group, said all the GEMS members deserve recognition for their refusal to fall prey to pessimism in dealing with the disease.

"It's not a 'why me?' kind of a group," Colling said. "It's people trying to make their lives better and the lives of their families better."

GEMS member Renee D'Orten said she enjoys the exercise class and sharing her experiences with others in the same situation has helped her to cope with MS.

"It really helps to bring it out in the open," D'Orten said. "When you hear how other people deal with it and their experiences, you don't feel so isolated."

Robin Grace, the Wellness Center coordinator for the Livonia YMCA and the instructor who heads the water aerobics class, said Colling has set a positive

example.

"People always say, 'I'm just one person, I can't make a difference,'" Grace said. "Well, she is a shining example that that's not true."

Grace said the group is more than just an exercise class.

"They are the highlight of my week," she said. "They've gotten to be like my family."

The group's class at the Y is also a demonstration of the difficult barriers disabled people must face. In order to access the locker rooms, YMCA members must walk down a flight of stairs then walk up a different flight to access the swimming pool.

GEMS members use a former weight room in the building as a dressing room and the windows are covered with large sheets of paper so people can't see in.

The open space does not allow for much privacy, and group members are often embarrassed,

Colling said.

Colling added that the YMCA has been extremely accommodating to her group. However, the building is not handicap accessible so her next goal is to raise money to install an elevator from the main floor of the building to the locker rooms.

"The people at the Livonia YMCA really have been cooperative and worked hard with us," she said. "The elevator will not only benefit GEMS, it will be nice for all handicapped people in the area."

Also as a part of the support meetings, once a month the group brings in speakers such as neurologists, psychologists, physical therapists and pharmacists to discuss advances in treatments and exchange ideas.

"We learn more about MS in the group, we know more about medicines," Colling said. "We learn more from each other than from

our doctors."

Group members range from young people in their early 20s to people in their 60s from all over the Detroit-metro area and from all sorts of professions.

But despite all their differences, the group has bonded together, Colling said.

"Everybody is so upbeat, they are very supportive of each other," she said.

Colling won't underestimate the group's ability to change someone's life.

"We had a man start coming to the meetings and one night he said, 'This is the first time since I found out I had MS that I feel like I'm doing something good for myself,'" Colling said with a smile.

"It's wonderful to have hope (about exercising). I don't know if I'm really doing myself any good, but if I think I am, then it's a wonderful thing."

trators, paraprofessionals, bus drivers, secretaries, maintenance staff and occupation and physical therapists.

Rezmierski said he expects this year's negotiations to go smoothly.

"There is no reason to believe that we will not maintain the same positive relationships we have in the past with our bargaining groups," he said.

The two-year faculty contracts with the district are due to expire Aug. 31, 1995.

The Northville Education Association ratified the current contract Sept. 2, 1993.

As part of the contract, teachers who are not a part of the salary

step-increase scale, which accounts for nearly 70 percent of the faculty, did not receive a pay increase for the 1993-94 school year and received a 3 percent increase this year.

Teachers on the step-increase scale received anywhere from a 1 percent to an 8.7 percent increase this school year depending on step level, in addition to the 3 percent wage hike.

Steps are determined by teachers' seniority.

An additional base wage level was also added to the step-increase scale this year, making teachers go through 12 steps before reaching the maximum wage.

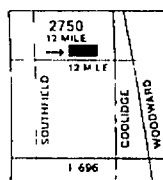

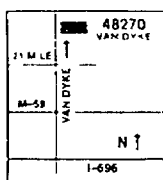

## District slapped with six figure bill

First, the bad news: Northville Public Schools owe Wayne County \$307,000 in chargebacks for the past two school years of the district's special education program and could owe even more money in years to come.

Now the good news: It could be worse and school officials are taking measures to correct the problem of excessive chargebacks.

School districts across the county are feeling the effects of the Wayne County Regional Educational Service Agency's \$45 million shortfall and have been saddled with the burden of paying off the red ink.

Under state statute, Wayne County collects 2 mills from all property owners annually - about \$54 million - to support programs and services for handicapped students countywide.

Each year, individual school districts draft budgets and make projections of how many special education students they expect to serve. Wayne County then provides funding based on those projections.

However, due to unexpected growth in the number of students that qualify for special education, the county has accumulated a \$45 million shortfall and, in turn, has handed the bill over to the individual districts.

"This is a very serious matter and one we cannot take lightly," said Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski.

Even though the school district owes Wayne County \$307,000, it could be worse, Rezmierski said. Some school districts owe millions of dollars.

One development that may ease the sting of the debt to the county is that Northville has some \$3 million coming this year from other school districts for its Bryant Center and Old Village School special education programs. That money, however, is already accounted for in current budgetary projections.

Northville owes Wayne County money from the 1992-93 and 1993-94 school years and has six years to pay it back. Last year the district set aside \$175,000 in anticipation of the chargebacks, and that amount will probably cover this year's debt installment to the county.

John Street, director of business and finance for the district, said he expects Northville will have to cough up \$150,000-160,000 each year for the next couple of years until the chargeback problem can be solved.

Currently, Northville Public Schools staff is working with other districts and state legislators to try and correct the problem.

Rezmierski said he believes better forecasting of student numbers by the county, concessions for mid-year adjustments of projections and the use of spot checks from auditors will help minimize chargebacks.

Rezmierski added that the district should have a clearer picture of what's going to happen by the end of February.

Although the district will be able to effectively deal with the money it owes the county this year, prospects for upcoming years make Rezmierski a bit more nervous. Now that the school district relies solely on the state for funding on a per-pupil basis, if Lansing runs into financial trouble, the schools will too.

That's why, Rezmierski said, it is important that the district's fund equity balance be increased. Currently, the district has built a reserve of 5 percent of its \$28 million budget - a goal that was set by the board a number of years ago.

The fund balance could help to soften the blow if the state's financial picture takes a turn for the worse in the next couple of years, or if the district faces even larger debts to the county.

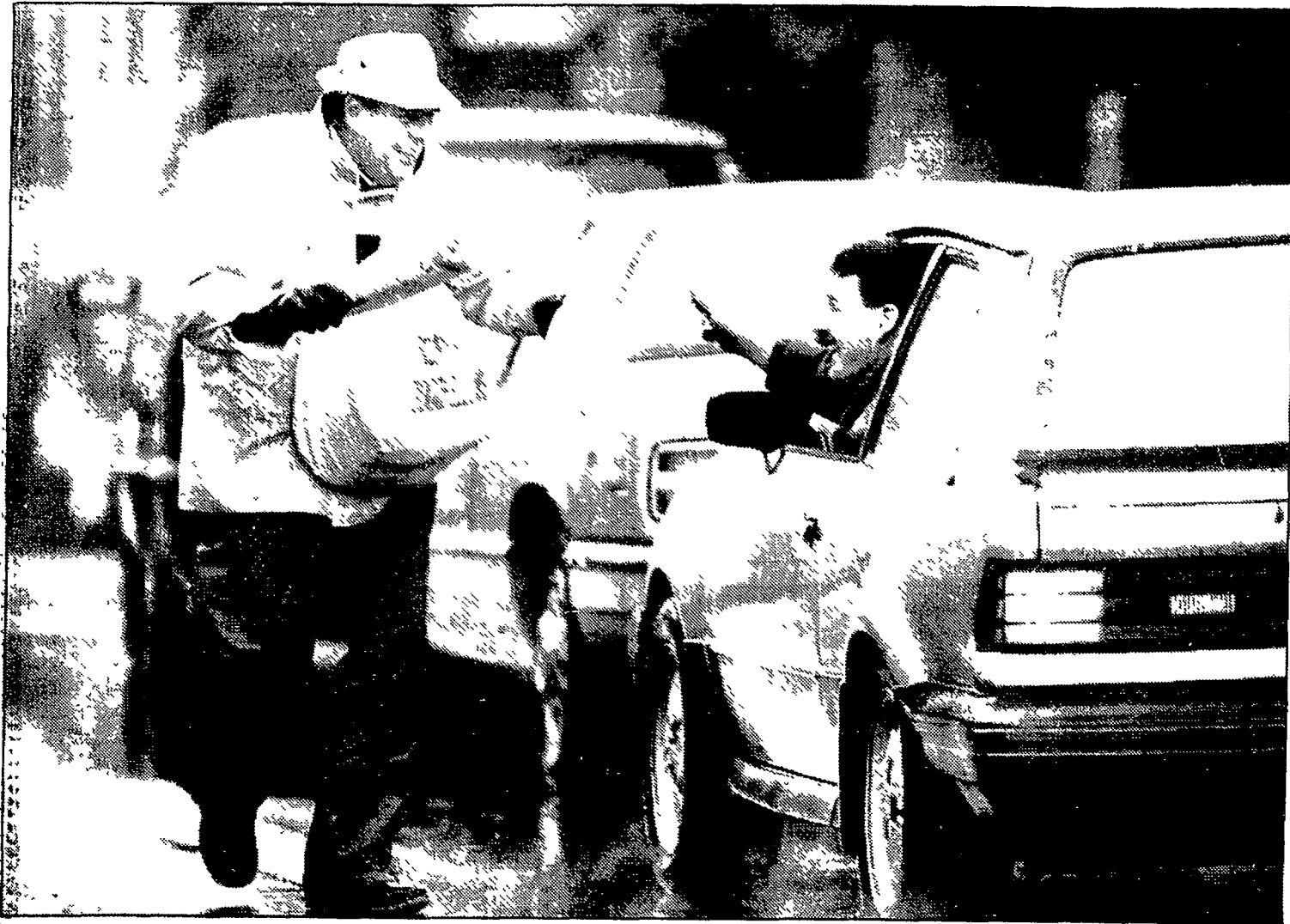

The Northville Community Chamber of Commerce has a new trademark.

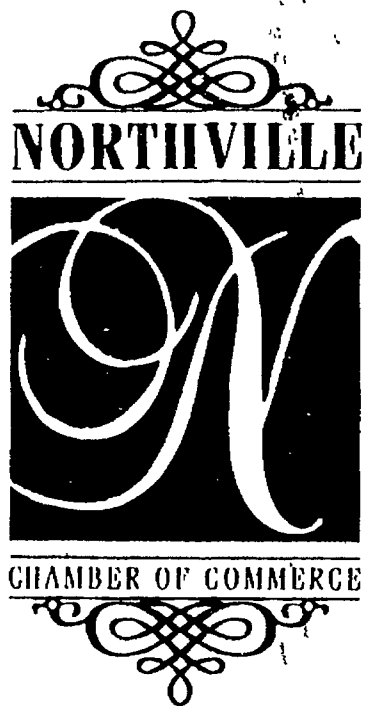
The new plum and teal logo with the large Victorian-style "N" can now be seen on all literature that comes from the office of the Chamber of Commerce.

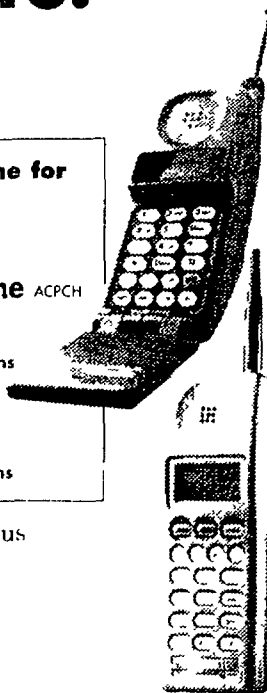

# Patterson pans idea of new taxes for suburban bus system

L. Brooks Patterson says the suburban bus system is likely to get \$4.5 million in new revenue next year — not the \$60 million being requested by its general manager.

"I don't think the public in the tri-county area or in Oakland County is willing to support a tax to the tune of \$60 million to support a merger of DDOT (Detroit's Department of Transportation) and SMART (Suburban Mobility Authority, the suburban bus system)," said Patterson, the Oakland County executive.

That number (\$60 million) was

arrived at, quite frankly, among the Big four (executives of Oakland and Wayne counties, chairman of Macomb County, mayor of Detroit).

"Dennis Archer, the mayor of

Detroit, said, 'I'm subsidizing my bus system to the tune of \$30 million, so I want \$30 million out of the pot.' So if Detroit wants \$30 million and the suburbs want \$30 million, that's your \$60 million.

"We're just never going to reach it. I buy into that (need for public transportation). I don't buy that it takes \$60 million to achieve it. If we learned anything (Nov. 8), it's 'make do with what you've got,' Lansing and Oakland County; don't ask for more."

"There's going to be a gas tax (increase). It won't be the 15 cents floated by the County Road Association. Maybe five cents. Whatever the governor says he needs, I'll support — no more, no less."

"For every penny that goes up, the SMART system gets \$900,000.

So five times nine is \$4.5 million. That's what we're going to get."

Patterson, the frequently pugnacious prosecutor of Oakland County for 16 years (1972-88), is in his first term as county executive and part of the Big Four that oversees public transportation. He was interviewed for the Nov. 27 "Spotlight on News" program on WXYZ-TV.

Michael Duggan, acting general manager of SMART and deputy Wayne County executive, told the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments late last summer

that it would take \$60 million in new revenue to accomplish the merger of SMART with Detroit's system and to extend the bus system to employment areas competing for workers.

Patterson agreed Oakland's economy is spectacular.

"They are paying bounties — \$1,000 for engineers. California has 460,000 designers and engineers (laid off from the aerospace industry). We're bringing back people to fill the jobs."

the church and the shopping center, with an entrance off of Haggerty and one off of Six Mile. Two more Haggerty entrances are also called for.

As large as all that sounds, however, the church, the center and the parking added together still don't make up even half of the site. The plan calls for no less than 55 percent of the total 139 acres to be preserved as natural open space or turned into active recreational areas like ballfields. Earlier versions of the plan included a 54-lot subdivision and an elderly housing center. Those components have been dropped, however, and the land added to the open/recreational spaces.

Ironically, as large as the 55 percent figure sounds, it's still not enough to satisfy the requirements of the HPUD ordinance. It says that at least 60 percent of the site has to be used for open space or residential uses, a standard the plan just misses.

Passed 18 months ago, the

HPUD ordinance applies to land which fronts onto Haggerty Road. It allows township officials to approve unconventional development projects there that normal zoning wouldn't allow, provided they believe a project brings "a recognizable and substantial benefit" to the township.

Sakwa's retinue of hired consultants tried their best to convince commissioners that the plan brings just that during the Tuesday meeting. They said that the HPUD plan they've put forth is far better than anything likely to be developed under the current zoning there.

The land near Haggerty is regularly zoned for office use, and the acreage at the western end of the site is residential. A strip of land zoned for park space splits the two.

Sakwa's consultants argued that the HPUD plan provides the township with a range of benefits that a conventional office building development or a typical subdivision wouldn't. Highest on the list

## Input session set on Brooklane

Residents of Northville Township will have their chance next month to sound off about a controversial subdivision/golf course proposal slated for Six Mile and Sheldon Roads.

The township's planning commission at its meeting Tuesday night honored developer Gary Sakwa's request for a Jan. 10 public hearing on his plan. They did so despite their open reservations about considering the plan when the board of trustees hasn't given a clear idea of whether it would approve an key element of it.

The proposal calls for a 280-lot subdivision and nine-hole golf course on 99 acres of land composed of the existing 18-hole Brooklane golf course and the Haller property. The parcels occupy the southeast and northeast corners of Six and Sheldon.

Sakwa has offered to give the township the course and a swimming pool he would build on the

site in return for approving the subdivision, which has higher home density than ordinance normally allows. Earlier this summer, the commission tabled the plan, asking the board to decide if the township was interested in owning a golf course or not.

The trustees did not make a formal decision on the matter when they considered it in August, however. Sakwa is among those who hope that the upcoming hearing will cause the board to do just that.

Based out of Farmington Hills, Sakwa ran into flak when he presented the idea to members of the commission and the board. Some said they felt the township shouldn't be involved in owning or running a golf course, fearing that it would be a money-loser. Others said they wouldn't approve the higher-than-allowed home density Sakwa's asking for, particularly since part of the land was recently rezoned for less density.

The course plan calls for 280

single-family homes. Of the 99 total acres, 29 are set aside for the golf course. Six of Brooklane's existing holes would be preserved and three new ones built on the north side of Six Mile. A bridge or tunnel would connect the three holes on the north with the six on the south.

An alternative plan which meets current zoning and density restrictions would have 243 lots but eliminates the golf course altogether and reduces the amount of open space from the course plan.

He's spent nine months working on the plan, Sakwa said, yet he still hasn't gotten a firm yes or no to it.

"We're here tonight in a kind of last-ditch effort to win approval of a plan that preserves the natural features of the land and provides the township with amenities it wouldn't normally have," he said. "We've been told to come back, come back, come back. We're back."

The commission this summer

tabled the plan, asking the board to decide if the township would consider owning a golf course or not.

At their Sept. 22 meeting, trustees received a memo outlining two options on how to conduct the study, but have not taken any action on it to date.

Two board members attended the meeting and agreed that the board had not made its position clear.

"I'm at as great a loss as the developer and the commission is," Supervisor Karen Baja said. "It's hard to determine the flavor of the board on this."

Sakwa said he wanted the public hearing so that citizen input could be gotten about the plan and the matter resolved.

"I'm happy to go with a straight subdivision, as ugly as it is," the developer said. "If you choose to deny me (approval of the course plan), be my guest."

## Preliminary DNR list names 15 city and township sites

tion, located on West Main Street.

Two Northville locales made the MDNR's proposed list of non-LUST sites:

• Sitting at number 36 on the list of the state's most-contaminated sites is General Oil's Northville oil-blending plant.

The Redford-based company's plant is located on Railroad Street and has made the MDNR's "most wanted" list for the last three years.

The MDNR list said that pollutants on the site include: polychlorinated biphenyl (PCB), lead, cadmium, as well as benzene, toluene, ethylbenzene, xylenes (BTEX), dichloroethylene (DCE), trichloroethylene (TCE) and trichloroethane (TCA).

• Added to the list since April is Ely Fuel Inc. The MDNR lists its pollutants as the BTEX compounds as well as polynuclear aromatic hydrocarbons (PNAs).

As defined by MERA, a site is regarded as having "environmen-

tal contamination." That, the MDNR says, happens when there has been "the release of a hazardous substance, or the potential release of a discarded hazardous substance in a quantity, which is or may become injurious to the environment, or to the public health, safety, or welfare."

MERA spells out how such sites are identified, evaluated and cleaned up. This is the 12th year that the MDNR has issued the list. Over that time the state Legislature has approved more than \$380 million for MERA activities.

State officials are looking for public input about the list. They're accepting written comments and will hold two public hearings next week. One will be in Marquette on Tuesday, the other in Lansing on December 8.

"This is to give the public the opportunity to comment on the list," local MDNR District Office Supervisor Dip Oyninsan said. "This is their chance to tell us what they think."

The hearing in Lansing will be held in the auditorium of the Michigan Library/Historical Center, located at 717 West Allegan St., from 7:30-9:30 p.m.

# Edenderry plan continues roller coaster ride

To Northville Township officials, the Woods of Edenderry is getting to be like a bad penny. It just keeps turning up.

The controversial subdivision plan was back before the board of trustees again, this time at the board's Nov. 17 meeting. Over the strident objections of developer Mark Guidobono's lawyer, the board voted 4-2 to table a new phase one of the plan.

At their Sept. 22 meeting, trustees voted 7-0 to adopt an amended version of the agreement they unanimously approved on Aug. 25. This time, the trustees refused to consider a new phasing plan for the Woods subdivision and would not grant final preliminary plat approval for the now-split phase one into phase 1-A and 1-B.

Trustee Gini Britton proposed tabling the plan, citing two reasons. First, she said she wanted to see the final determination of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources concerning the wetlands on the subdivision site.

"It could have an impact on this plan," she said.

Second, Britton said, township

ordinance requires that the board approve all phases of a plan together. To date, she said, "this board has never seen this full plan."

The vote was 4-2 to table. Voting in favor were Trustees Britton, Russ Fogg and Barbara O'Brien, as well as Clerk Sue Hillebrand. Voting against the motion were Supervisor Karen Baja and Treasurer Rick Engelland. Trustee Mark Abbo absent from the meeting.

Joe Galvin, attorney for Woods developer Mark Guidobono, was angry at the decision, calling it "inappropriate and totally unfair."

He immediately asked the board to rescind its resolution to table and take up the issue again. Fogg, who moments before had voted to table, moved to reconsider. The vote on that issue ended up deadlocked 3-3. Fogg switched his vote to side with Baja and Engelland.

Since the vote was a tie, however, the tabling stood.

That led to harsh comments from Galvin.

"What I have to say is simple and short," the lawyer said before speaking for several minutes.

Phase one of the Woods plan is

"There is just no valid basis for the action this board has taken. I have no idea why Cambridge (Development) is being held hostage. Cambridge has done everything that has been asked of it."

entitled to the board's approval according to both state law and the township's own charter, Galvin said. He claimed his client had played by the rules, adding that there was no justifiable reason for the vote.

"There is just no valid basis for the action this board has taken," Galvin said. "I have no idea why Cambridge (Development) is being held hostage. Cambridge has done everything that has been asked of it."

Despite the remarks, trustees declined to discuss the matter further. They were considering holding a special meeting on the issue this week.

The Woods of Edenderry proposal was first presented to the township's planning commission in April. It calls for a 101-lot subdivi-

sion on 70-odd acres south of the Edenderry Hills and Shadbrook neighborhoods. They lie south of Seven Mile and west of Sheldon.

Residents there have raised a number of objections to the plan, especially the fact that it calls for the streets in the Woods subdivision to be connected to their neighborhood. Those links, Hills residents say, will result in more traffic and crime in their quiet neighborhood.

The township's Department of Public Safety, planning consultants and the commission do not agree, however. They maintain that the road connections are necessary for better emergency vehicle access to the Hills and to ensure proper traffic flow in the area. Officials of Wayne County, which own the roads, also believe the connec-

tors are necessary

On June 28, the township's planning commission recommended the board approve the Woods plan with the street links intact. That led to weeks of negotiations between township officials, Guidobono and the homeowners' associations. The talks led to the agreement of Aug. 25 and the modified version of Sept. 22.

All parties agreed to a complex deal.

A design plan for the Woods subdivision was submitted which does not include street connections to the existing subdivisions to the north. Instead, the first phase of the plan calls for two cul-de-sacs, while the second phase calls for an eyebrow-shaped loop to run between two existing dead-end streets in the Hills, with homes to be built on it.

The necessary outside agencies have given their OK to the phase one plan. The new wrinkle is that phase one, while remaining the same, is now divided into phases 1-A and 1-B.

Guidobono, the deal says, can pursue informal approval of the loop plan from Wayne County.

He'll then submit it to the township's planning commission, to begin the approval process anew.

If county road officials don't accept it, however, the next step is to petition the Wayne County Commission for approval. The loop plan would need the votes of at least eight of the 15 members of the commission.

Sometimes during the procedure, the homeowners' associations would get the chance to make their pitch against the street links to the county.

If that route is unsuccessful, the township will then consider taking the county to court to win approval of the plan under the terms of the agreement. The agreement does not require the board to do so, however.

If the township does choose to sue, Guidobono has agreed that he will not seek approval of the second phase of the June 28 plan - which includes the street connections - for a year. If the township chooses not to sue, the agreement continues, then Guidobono can seek board approval for either immediately.



## Letters are running against sports center

Most Northville Township residents who've written letters to their local officials or newspaper have expressed strong reservations about the recent proposal for a multi-use sports arena on Beck Road.

The township planning commission met Tuesday, Nov. 29. In the information packet which each commissioner received were 17 letters concerning township resident John Hamilton's preliminary plan put forth to township officials last month.

Hamilton owns land off Beck Road between Five and Six Mile. He has developed a preliminary proposal for a privately-owned, \$8.5 million multi-purpose sports complex there. The arena would include two ice rinks, basketball courts, a Powerhouse Gym, a restaurant and several other amenities. Although no formal plan has been submitted to the commission, Hamilton has said he's looking for three things from the township:

- A special land use permit and/or rezoning of his land in order to build the arena.

- A liquor license for the restaurant.

Of the 17 commission letters, every one expressed outright opposition to or reservations about the proposal, particularly the request for rezoning or a land use permit. To date, *The Northville Record* has received 16 letters to the editor concerning the plan. Of them, 14 expressed opposition or reservations about the proposal and two supported it.

Here are some samples of the opinions expressed in the letters:

- Peter Cwik wrote that conversations with his Hickory Creek subdivision neighbors "indicated unanimous and vehement opposition to ice rink construction in the proposed site."

"Plainly speaking," he added, "we have seldom seen such visceral opposition to a proposed building."

- Speaking of the zoning/land use issue, Rita Mavel wrote that it "would be a grave injustice to the Northville home owners who live

nearby."

- "We moved to Northville 10 years ago for one reason," John and Phyllis Spears wrote. "It was a quiet, peaceful, safe community. The rural area of Six Mile/Beck," they continue, "has continuously been under development within the past five years."

- "Absolutely not!" wrote Art Zdawczyk and his wife.

"The idea of a sports complex certainly has merit," they add, "but in the proper location."

- "We feel this would be very disruptive to our city," Bill and Fay Skotanis said.

- "If this type of (zoning/land use) change is allowed," wrote Joan Bahl, "we will never again be able to regain control over our greatest resource, a desirable residential township."

The arena proposal did have strong support among other letter writers, however.

- Michael Paletta wrote that he supported the plan and charged that opponents living near Six and Beck are selective when it comes to worrying about the facility's possible effect on the area.

"Have they forgotten, or did they just fail to mention, the prison one mile away or the trash dump two miles?" wrote Michael Paletta. "These same folks must be shocked to learn that our community also contains a race track and a psychiatric hospital and that somehow we all manage to live and work together with an outstanding quality of life."

"The Northville area is not exactly besieged with developers' proposed major community development projects at little or no cost to taxpayers. I for one applaud Mr. Hamilton."

- "Northville needs to seize this opportunity, now!" wrote the Mudge family, saying that it would provide a range of recreational alternatives for Northville youth and adults.

"Why not Northville for a sports complex?" they asked. "There is such a demand and need. Our community is a beautiful one, and one that we are all proud of. Let's devote some land to a facility that our kids could use for many years to come."

## Mill Race Matters

As always the Northville Historical Society Children's Christmas Workshop filled to capacity. The 16th such event will be held this Saturday, Dec. 3, from 10 a.m. to noon and from 1 to 3 p.m. Parents should drop off and pick up children at the Wash Oak School so that gift surprises can be maintained.

Members gather on Friday, Dec. 16, to celebrate with some holiday cheer. Bring an appetizer to share and your own choice of beverage along with a glass. Meet at the Cady Inn from 7 p.m. to 1 p.m. Call Cheryl, 348-1845, to confirm your attendance. Member Mary Peski coordinates this event.

One additional Historical Society presents this column each Thursday to keep members of the community and the organization informed about events occurring at Mill Race Village. During the winter when activities diminish it also includes highlights on community history.

Last week first supervisor William Bartow and his contributions were featured as were those of the first teacher Elizabeth Yerkes. This week some additional community firsts which come from the memories of Abraham Markham who was first tax collector.

According to Markham the first minister who preached was Elder Hickox who lived on the banks of the Rouge (probably just above Mill Race Village near today's Griswold). The first doctor settled in the community was Dr. J.F. Davis. Henry B. Holbrook became first justice of the peace after appointment by the governor and legislative council. John Miller located on the site of today's Mill Race Village becoming the community's first blacksmith. Gideon Benton, holder of the earliest land title, served as first postmaster.

Parna Phillips, wife of David, gave birth to Northville's first newborn, Oscar. Parna died in 1846 and is buried at Northville's Waterford Cemetery. The daughter of Erastus Starkweather became the first to be married in the new community. Who she married is not recorded. Samuel Sterling owned the first horse.

During the early years of this community Native Americans still roamed the area albeit seldomly. Markham tells of one unhappy experience of his own in which one wandering individual depleted him of his entire food supply due to his own negligence.

New settlers helped one another regularly. He tells of Daniel Cady coming to him in March 1826 to request aid in getting dimensions for lots of land. It was on Cady's property that the village of Northville was eventually established.

Marham built a mill of his own at about the same time John Miller established his grist mill on the site of today's Mill Race Village in 1827. Also in 1827 the new settlers in the area met to establish a local government and elect officers. It was at this meeting that the name Plymouth was selected for the entire township.

Marham's reminiscences come from Jack Hoffman's Book, *The First Hundred Years*, written several years ago. It is still available for sale along with three other Historical Society publications and can be purchased from the organization of from Bookstall on the Main, 101 Center. They make an excellent Christmas gifts for those new to the community or residents interested in learning about this community's past. Proceeds from all four books are used for the maintenance and operation of Mill Race Village.

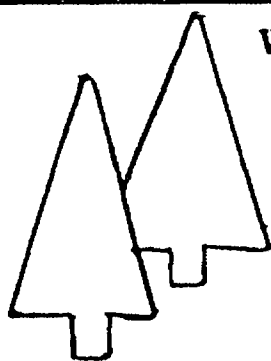

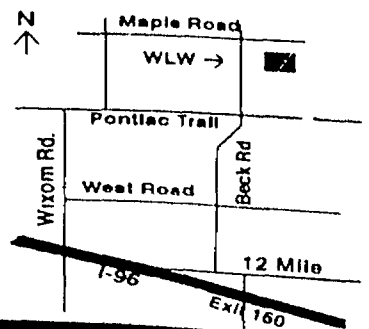

# Governor endorses user fee concept

Voters in Wayne County and many suburbs would decide the fate of an airport tax and recycling fees, under a recommendation endorsed by Gov. John Engler.

"Mandatory user fees" for recycling are used by the cities of Rochester Hills, Novi, Farmington, Farmington Hills and Wixom; the village of Milford; and the townships of Bloomfield and Redford.

"There are a lot of communities with 'mandatory user fees' that this report says must be voter-approved," said Patrick L. Anderson, deputy state budget director and a member of the governor's commission.

Wayne County's 30 percent tax on parking at Detroit Metropolitan Airport, 5 percent charges for 911 emergency telephone service and Detroit's utility users tax also should be approved by voters, not imposed by governing boards, the report said.

The 12-member Blue Ribbon Commission for Review of the 1978 Headlee (tax limitation) Amendment included Anderson, a Farmington Hills resident and chair of the 11th Congressional District Republican organization; his boss, budget director Patti Woodworth; state treasurer Doug

Roberts; and Gary Wolfram, Hillsdale College economist and member of the State Board of Education. Wolfram chaired the panel.

Dissenting on the user fees section were three local-government members: Elaine Skarritt, Milford Township clerk and president of the Michigan Townships Association; Gene Thornton, lobbyist for the townships association; and John Logie of the city of Grand Rapids.

The dissenters said it's impossible to prove that a user fee isn't a tax. "How does one prove a negative? And to whom?" they asked rhetorically.

The dissenters said local recycling programs "have been established in good faith on the basis that the user fee approach was acceptable and valid. A retrenchment now would not only cause a likely disruption of existing programs, but also stifle further advancement and development of this socially desirable goal."

Despite the dissent, Engler told the commission he would direct the treasurer, his legal counsel and budget director to address the administrative concerns. "I will also ask our legislative leaders to work with us on legislation addressing other recommendations," he said.

The report covers all facets of the 1978 lengthy Headlee amendment to the financial article (IX) of the Michigan Constitution. The report's section on local government fees is likely to stir the most controversy in the 1995 legislative session.

The report defines as a "fee" as payment for a voluntary service, including fines for violations of law. But the panel said a charge for mandatory services such as recycling and 911 emergency service are unconstitutional unless approved by voters.

"The commission recommends that the Legislature amend each statute that authorizes establishment of a jurisdiction-wide assessment district to finance general government services" to require voter approval.

Among other recommendations:

- Wayne County's 30 percent tax on airport parking - which ranks with Montana's 30 percent tax on coal sold to Detroit Edison Co. as one of the highest levies in the nation - also should be approved by voters, because "the revenue from this tax, although ostensibly imposed by the state, flows directly back to the cities and counties in which a regional airport is located."

- Convention bureau marketing taxes of one to two percent on hotels and motels with more than 10 rooms should be subject to a vote of the people, not just hotel-motel owners. "These statutes effectively create local authorities that levy taxes and make expenditures without any control by the citizenry," it said.

- "A very similar statute, the 'Tiger Stadium Tax' act (PA 180 of 1991), authorizes an explicit excise tax on hotel and motel accommodations in municipalities or counties constructing or reconstructing a stadium or convention facility."

"Under the Headlee amendment, such a tax must be approved by the voters of the municipality, and none has yet sought such approval. The similarity between the explicit excise tax on hotels and the 'assessments' is so strong as to make them almost indistinguishable - as indeed they are to the hotel customer."

- State government has avoided the tax-limitation amendment by requiring local units to perform them. "The commission recommends that no bill be enacted unless the Legislature is aware of the cost of implementation when voting on it."

## Novi gets clean fiscal bill of health

Don't worry about this patient, who's robust, healthy and well-fed.

That's what the auditors say about the City of Novi's financial state. As a matter of fact, the major advice the financial whizzes have this year is for the city to position itself so it can gobble up more shared revenues from the state.

From 1980 to 1990, Novi's population sprouted by 45 percent. Joe Heffernan of Plante & Moran, the city's auditors, suggests that Novi fund a mid-decade census to verify how much development has gone on over the past five years. If the growth rate is higher than 15 percent, the city can rake in more of the revenues from the Michigan income tax, sales tax and small businesses taxes, which are distributed by the state to each community.

"In the 1980s, even though Novi did this, the state didn't at first come across with money, but

we did get in the last three years (of the decade), \$300,000 a year," Heffernan said.

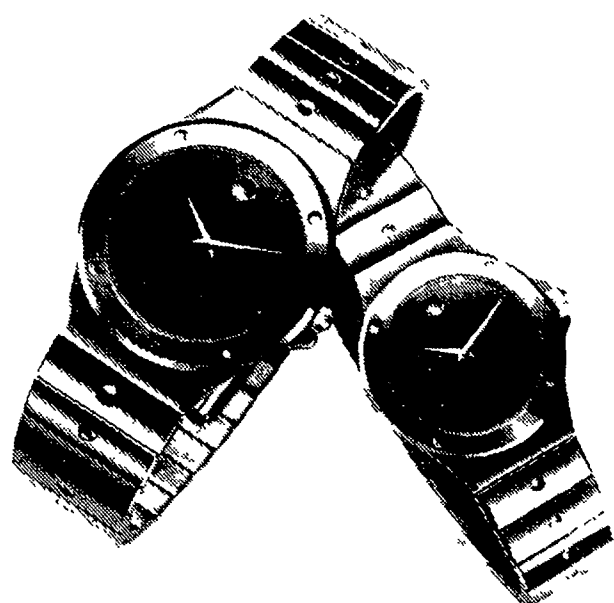
Novi gets about 17 percent of its incoming money from this source, with up to a six percent increase anticipated for next year.

On Nov. 21, the auditors reported on Novi's fiscal year 1993-94, which ended in June.

As of then, the city's total assets were valued at over \$217 million, with \$23 million of that in cash. Novi carries a total long term debt of just under \$66 million.

"Novi is really a growing city and Novi has real infrastructure needs. It makes Novi look very different than other cities. The infrastructure, construction and debt service are higher than other cities," Heffernan explained.

"This is a special city. You have special needs you wouldn't see in other. With a population growth expected to keep rising upwards, the council may need to determine what increases should be made in city services."

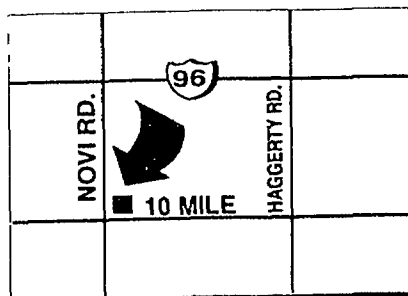

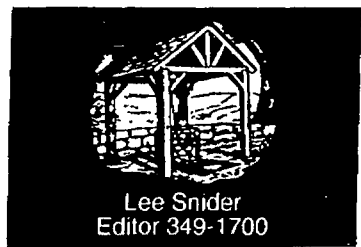

### New township head offers reason to hope

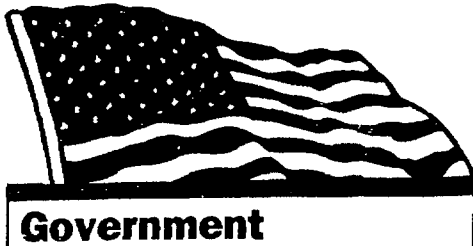
Beginnings can be great. They have a tendency to make old things new again and an ability to inspire a sense of renewal and reassessment. Newness in a relationship, whether personal or professional, can cause you to look at yourself and your surroundings afresh, and see things untainted by the dull varnish of overfamiliarity.

There is newness at Northville Township Hall. The township's new manager, Tammy Hanlin, began her tenure with the township on Monday of this week. We have high hopes for her success, as there is more at stake than just atmospherics and a more pleasant approach to doing business. Efficiency and public opinion also hang in the balance.

Organizational and leadership abilities are badly needed in Northville Township government. At only brief and sporadic periods during the two-year run of the current board of trustees has there been an effective management presence. Far more often, there has either been no manager at all or an air of combativeness between the hired administrator and the elected representatives. No one has seemed to know who's in control, and everyone has seemed more than eager to move in and seize the reins.

This lack of definition in the roles of authority at the township is at least partly responsible for the inefficiencies that characterize the board's deliberations. Trustees often appear to be lost or hampered by a habit of making arbitrary judgments. Personalities are also somewhat to blame.

In any event, the unwillingness of trustees to work constructively together

er has not just led to blaring headlines. There have been tangible consequences. Just about everyone you talk to attributes the defeat of the quite reasonable Aug. 2 millage requests to voters' dissatisfaction with the conduct of their legislators.

Hanlin was hired in as an at-will employee, meaning she can be terminated without a notification period. Given the board's track record with managers, this may have been wise. Then again, perhaps a longterm commitment might have been a good sign and indicative of a resolve to tough it out in spite of the possibility of conflict.

Past history aside, we are relieved that a new manager is finally on board in the township. By all accounts, Hanlin is intelligent and personable. We wish her every success. The smartest thing we on the outside can do is to continue to press for a higher standard of professionalism from everyone on the public payroll in the township. The best thing trustees can do is to allow Hanlin some breathing space.

Keep in mind that the manager in Northville Township's governmental structure is not meant to be a figurehead - she is the principal administrator of the municipality. Give her a fair shot at shaping the future direction of the township.

### Good move in readying contract talks early

Northville school district officials have taken an advisable step in preparing for upcoming contract discussions with the district's seven bargaining units early - very early. The union contracts don't expire until June 30, 1995, but representatives are already laying the groundwork for the negotiations.

Officials say they want to get things moving several months ahead of time because of funding and academic uncertainties resulting from new state mandates. Local changes, such as the restructured Wednesday at the high school, could also have an unforeseeable impact on contract discussions, they believe.

Early negotiations are often used as a means of avoiding strikes. Northville was never really a strike district in the past and now that legislation has been passed punishing teacher walkouts there is even less likelihood of a work stoppage. Nevertheless, we think the decision to begin preliminary work toward discussions is a good-faith sign

that can only have positive benefits.

Talking contract while the funding picture is still somewhat unclear can be a little risky, but last year's discussions were conducted in much the same climate and the results were encouraging.

The two-year pact reached last summer contained modest raises for instructors and opener clauses in case revenues fell short of projections. This suggests that agreements concluded in an atmosphere of uncertainty lead to conservative, rather than extravagant, outcomes.

Perhaps all the advanced preparation will result in a reasonable and responsible set of contracts for the district's seven bargaining units.

A tone of fiscal conservatism was established at the table last year. Here's hoping that set the district on a path that will carry over into the current round of discussions.

## ... But thick skin is useful too

Last week I went to a bar somewhere in Detroit with my friends to take advantage of the shortened work week.

Through all the drunken revelry, raucous music and broken bits of conversation, characteristic of any typical bar scene, I managed to learn something about myself and what a job like mine can do to an average person like me.

As the night began to wind down and we were getting ready to leave, a girlfriend of mine and I found ourselves in a fortuitous position by the bar's entrance. We were standing there minding our own business when a stampede of bouncers swiftly moved toward the door.

Unfortunately, my friend and I realized we were dead center in the path of this tornado of manly muscle too late to move out of the way. We were swept up by the angry group and hastily escorted out of the bar along with some drunken patron who probably got too rowdy for his own good.

Once the haze cleared and the numerous bouncers reentered the bar, we dusted ourselves off and I was surprised to see only one rather slim guy standing outside on the sidewalk with an embarrassed expression. Was it really necessary for all these stalwart men to rough up one guy and in the process risk the lives of two others?

OK, maybe I'm exaggerating a bit, but I was startled by the incident and reentered the building mulling something about "damn macho bouncers" to my friends.

Well, Dino, the name a friend called him as he left, overheard my irritated remarks and gave me a piece of his mind - rather loudly.

He yelled something about me not understanding the plight of bouncers in a voice that was similar to that of Rocky Balboa, the character in the famous series of

For weeks I wrestled with these issues, knowing some people had been hurt by what I had written - people I knew by name, and have known for years.

When I first started this job, I was excited to work in the same community I had grown up in, to see the familiar, friendly faces I had seen my whole life.

At the same time, however, I was taking a risk because I knew there would come a time when I would have to paint one of those faces in an unpleasant light.

Well, five-and-a-half months into the job, it happened and because of it, I'm not so popular now.

Not to say that my position is comparable to the people I'm forced to write about. But it is an unnerving feeling to walk into the local grocery store or restaurant and worry whether you will see a hostile face in the crowd. I'll have to get used to it from time to time - thus the thick skin.

It comes with the territory, I guess. Sad but true.

In his letter to "Friends and Skating Enthusiasts," Mr. Engelland outlines the alleged benefits of an ice skating arena and urges the readers to "become disciples of support for the Hamilton complex."

The next to last line in his letter reads, "Remember, there is no cost to the community ... only benefits!" We would challenge Mr. Engelland to explain how a 12-year 50 percent tax abatement, significantly increased traffic on already congested Beck Road, drunk drivers emerging from the lounge at 2 a.m., and the subsequent drop in area property values (and taxes) resulting from the introduction of a massive commercial enterprise in the middle of a residential area amounts to "no cost to the community."

We cannot fathom why with all of the commercial land available in Northville Township that this complex needs to be built in a neighborhood of homes. If Mr. Engelland really has the best interests of the community in mind, then he should help find a site that will not destroy the community he is supposed to represent.

# Democrats can take a page from GOP

Don't expect to see a whole lot coming out of the two-day lame duck session of the Legislature this week. The real action will come next year, when Republicans add slim control of the House (56-54) to their sizable majority in the Senate (22-16) and the governorship.

You'll hear much confident talk this week, though. Republicans will be riding on the crest of their big election victory, talking about their own conservative "Contract with Michigan." Democrats will insist that things weren't so bad, really, with only a one-vote swing in the state House in the midst of a national GOP landslide.

Both need to look beyond their noses, and this week's session is as good a time as any to do it.

Being the minority party, Democrats have the more intense need. Their problem is not merely finding a charismatic candidate to run for governor and better media consultants. Their problem is that they are largely out of ideas.

It has been a long, long time since G. Mennen Williams and Neil Staebler built the modern Democratic Party on a base of liberal ideology and broad citizen participation. The ideology, like most, has had its 50-year run and is now pretty shopworn. And broad citizen participation is often an unnecessary inconvenience in the eyes of a lot of party bosses.

Recasting the Democratic Party is going to take some time, great effort and a lot of thought.

One good place for minority lawmakers to start is to steal a useful device from the Republicans: legislative task forces. Beginning in the late 1980s, when they were a minority, GOP lawmakers created a series of task forces to study public policy issues.

Their purpose was to propose specific policy and legislative changes

for a series of high-profile policy issues. Minority status being what it is, most of their ideas were not adopted. More importantly, they represented a concrete way of acting on the conviction that political majorities are the ultimate consequence of good and appealing ideas.

Republicans, for their part, would do well to think again about the rules of the political process, which they now are in a position largely to control.

This subject may invite more than the usual Lansing hypocrisy. Consider, just for fun, the likely relative durability of GOP commitments to the doctrine of term limits, now that Republicans are in the majority.

More important, it's time to reflect on an unintended consequence of term limits that shows up in this past election: There were more than a dozen hotly contested legislative races, each involving more than \$200,000 in TV and direct-mail advertising.

Where do you think the money came from to finance these races? Certainly not from grass-roots contributions of faithful party members. It came from precisely the same business and labor interests that term limits were originally supposed to put in their place.

And the problem will get worse in years to come as term limit laws dislodge long-time incumbents from office, setting off more and more of these absurdly expensive elections.

The cash will be raised in the future just as it is now: by House and Senate leaders who bundle contributions from lobbyists and special interests and dispense it to local candidates who go along with the program. Result: More negative campaigning, more partisanship, more control by big money interests.

So far, the Republican response to this problem has been hotly partisan: Shut down the Democrats' successful bingo operations.

Certainly, something more far-reaching and more in the public interest is called for.

The house is a public health hazard and the residents of the community have a right to know exactly where it is located and what is being done to correct the situation. A newspaper's job is to report the facts.

The carbon monoxide leak would not have happened had the house been properly maintained. I dread to think of the potential danger to the surrounding area. What if poor maintenance to the water heater resulted in a gas leak causing the house to explode? Shouldn't the neighbors be aware of the potential danger (which still may exist)? The house is within two blocks of two schools.

For Ms. Yezbeck to say that it would suffice for The Northville Record to say merely that "a Northville resident had died from carbon monoxide poisoning that resulted from a leak in her water heater" is an irresponsible statement. When it comes to public safety, the community needs to be completely informed, and it's the job of the local newspaper to do so.

Certainly, everyone's heart went out to Mrs. Myers who lost her life in a needless manner. One can't help but wonder why her family, friends and neighbors didn't give her the help she needed to maintain her home before it came to this.

Mrs. Myers lived in horrendous conditions which were totally unrelated to the carbon monoxide leak. The smell of dead, decaying cats and cat waste was so bad it could be detected from the street. Could no one help this poor woman?

Perhaps others will learn a lesson from this very unfortunate situation. If you know of some-

one living in this kind of condition, give them a hand. If you are not able to help, report it to an agency that will. There is assistance available for those in need.

## HOLIDAY TREATS

### OLIVE CANAPES

1 dozen English muffins (24 halves)  
3/4 cup green olives sliced (buy sliced salad olives)  
3/4 cup mayonnaise  
3/4 cup grated cheddar cheese  
1/4 tsp curry powder

Mix all ingredients. Spread on muffins and bake 10 minutes at 400 degrees (make sure cheese is melted). Cut each half into four pieces. Olive mixture can be made ahead of time and refrigerated. Serve on trays or platters

### STUFFED MUSHROOMS

150 mushroom caps  
1 cup butter or margarine, melted  
3/4 cup chopped parsley  
1 tbsp minced garlic  
1 tsp coarsely ground black pepper  
3/4 cup fresh bread crumbs  
1 tsp lemon juice  
3 boxes Melba rounds

Clean mushrooms, removing stems, and place on shallow, open proof dish, stem side up. Combine melted butter, parsley, garlic, black pepper and lemon juice. Put about 1/2 teaspoon bread crumbs into cavity of each mushroom. Spoon butter mixture over crumb filling. Bake at 400 degrees 10 to 15 minutes. Place each mushroom on a Melba round and serve on a platter garnished with red leaf lettuce or red kale. Mushrooms can be made ahead of time and refrigerated

### FRUIT PLATTER

2 lbs. green grapes  
2 lbs. red seedless grapes  
1 qt. strawberries  
1 pt. low fat vanilla yogurt

Rinse fruit thoroughly. Cut grapes into sections of 5 to 10 grapes per cut. Arrange fruit on platter, alternating red and green. Place yogurt dip in center. Have toothpicks available for dipping

### HUMMUS

2 cans garbanzo beans (chick peas) partially drained  
1 clove garlic finely chopped  
2 tbsp. Tahini (a sesame seed butter)  
1/4 tsp salt  
5 tbsp. lemon juice  
2 pkgs. 6-inch pita bread

Put ingredients into blender or food processor and mix at high speed until smooth. Do not over blend or mixture will become watery. Pour mixture onto platter. Can be garnished with red pepper, olives, parsley and olive oil. Cut each piece of pita bread into eight pieces. Serve in a basket. This recipe can be made in advance and refrigerated (cover with plastic wrap)

### SURPRISE MEATBALLS

2 lbs. lean ground beef  
1 lb. sweet Italian sausage, casing removed  
1 egg beaten  
1 garlic clove, peeled, minced  
1/8 teaspoon dried basil  
salt to taste  
pepper to taste

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In a large mixing bowl combine ground beef and sausage, mix well. Add beaten egg, garlic, basil, salt and pepper, mix thoroughly. Add the milk or half-and-half and burgundy wine; mix thoroughly. Sprinkle bread crumbs over meat mixture and work in; mix thoroughly. Form about 48 walnut-size meatballs. Insert piece of water chestnut into center of meatball. Make sure water chestnut is concealed by meat mixture. Place meatballs on a broiler pan with rack and bake for 30 minutes. To prepare sauce, follow directions on package doubling the amount of water required. Pour sauce over cooked meatballs. Serve in chafing dish or fondue pot. Meatballs can be frozen. To reheat, allow to thaw and place in chafing dish at medium heat

### ITALIAN QUESADILLAS

2 pkgs. flour tortillas  
20 thin slices of Provolone cheese  
8 oz. Gorgonzola cheese  
14 3/4 oz. jar artichoke hearts  
4 oz. jar sliced pimento

Chop artichokes into small pieces using food chopper. Spread softened Gorgonzola cheese on 10 tortillas. Place artichoke and pimento pieces on top. Put one piece of Provolone cheese on each and cover with remaining tortillas. Place tortillas on hot grill or fry pan (spray grill or pan with Pam to prevent sticking). Cook on each side for 3 to 4 minutes or until lightly browned. Allow to cool slightly and cut into 4 wedges. Serve on warming tray

### PUNCHES

#### WINE PUNCH

4 liters blush wine  
1 liter club soda  
1 liter Seven Up  
Garnish with an ice ring

#### NON-ALCOHOLIC PUNCH

Equal parts of apple juice and Sprite  
Garnish with an ice ring

### MEXICAN DIP

1 8 oz. pkg. light cream cheese, softened  
1 15 oz. can old El Paso fat free refried beans  
1 15 oz. can Hormel No Bean Turkey Chili  
1 8 oz. pkg. light or fat free, shredded cheddar cheese  
1 large tomato, cut in small pieces

Spread softened cream cheese on platter. Next spread a layer of refried beans. Add bean chili layer. (Not all of the can's contents may fit.) Sprinkle shredded cheese over the whole dip. Microwave for 5 to 7 minutes. Top with diced tomatoes. Make sure center is warm. Serve with blue chips. Can be made ahead and refrigerated

## Ludwig counsels expectant mothers

Free pregnancy tests attract most of the women who come to Another Way Pregnancy Center at 39575 West Ten Mile, according to Winnie Ludwig, who is one of 30 counselors.

The women she has met in six years there, she said, have been 13 to 37 years of age, with most in their teens and early 20s.

If the test is positive, "we encourage her going to a doctor," and also "talk with her parents."

At this first meeting, Ludwig said, she shows tapes on abortion and adoption, plus an ultra-sound movie.

It's after seeing the ultra sound, she said, that the woman is "more apt to decide to carry the child."

If she needs help in knowing where to sit out the pregnancy, Ludwig directs her to a number of shelters such as Social Services, the Salvation Army, the Rescue Mission, and to "a short list of women who take girls into their

own homes."

"The girls give phone numbers where we can call them - their married home, parents, boy friend - to follow up. They know we care."

"I'm here once a week for four hours," she said. She usually sees one or two women, but she has had "as many as seven."

She doesn't understand why schools can't teach sex education in terms of "respect for themselves."

"You can give up sex if you have a goal to make something of your life," she said. "We each have the right to determine what we want to be."

Training? Ludwig said that an experienced counselor instructed her in how to put a client at ease and how to listen. And she sat with her for the first two months.

## Showgirls and gangsters

Woody Allen uses Broadway to study the artist's dilemma in 'Bullets over Broadway'

Woody Allen's latest film, "Bullets Over Broadway," is a comedy set in the Roaring '20s and takes place in the world of gangsters and showgirls.

Although Allen has had experience as a Broadway playwright (his "Don't Drink the Water" was produced in 1966), he insists that this was not his inspiration for the chaotic, layered story that unravels in "Bullets Over Broadway."

"It just seemed a good comic notion that I had ... a funny idea that would make a funny movie," said Allen of the origins of his latest film. He made the decision to set his timeless story of the artist's dilemma within a specific time frame — the 1920s.

"This story is much more appropriate set in the context of the turbulent 1920s because in those days you did have showgirls and gangsters and Broadway as in its heyday," said Allen. "This setting is where these characters could be seen at maximum advantage. If you did the story now, you get a completely different equation; you have a different type of gangster and different type of Broadway show."

In "Bullets Over Broadway," a struggling Greenwich Village playwright David (John Cusack) is given the opportunity of directing his latest drama on Broadway under the auspices of a respected producer (Jack Warden) with one very significant string attached — he must cast the singularly untalented showgirl moll, Olive (Jennifer Tilly), of a Damon Runyon-esque gangster (Joe Viterelli) in the role of a psychiatrist.

The proposed production is a double-edged temptation for the conflicted playwright, as he is offered one of Broadway's leading luminaries (Dianne Wiest), albeit a rather self-obsessed diva with a fondness for the grape, and a strong supporting cast (Tracey Ullman, Jim Broadbent), if he will

only compromise his vision by casting Olive in his play.

Ultimately, the playwright compromises himself so completely that he can never see himself as the true artist he aspires to be, and the real artist of the story

emerges from the most unlikely and unexpected source — the showgirl's gruff bodyguard Cheech (Chazz Palminteri), who ends up rewriting the playwright's work.

Against a tapestry of bathtub gin, backstage dramas, leggy flap-

pers and warring gangsters enjoying nights out at the Cotton Club, "Bullets Over Broadway" explores the differences between the person who lives his whole life with all the trappings of the artist — living in the village, hanging out in coffee

houses and having wine and cheese for dinner — and the person who is, perhaps just by accident of birth, genuinely an artist, whose work is unselfconsciously meaningful to people, and who has a real passion for his work.

The character of Cheech (played by Palminteri) is the genuine artist. "He is a perfectionist," said Allen. "He has a vision and he wants it exactly that way, and would even kill to have it that way."

David, on the other hand, compromises all the way down the line from the start. In the first scene in the picture, he's carrying on about how he won't change a word of his play. But the truth of the matter is that he's ready to put the play on with this bad actress in it to get it on, and he's ready to make changes to suit Dianne Wiest when she's seducing him, and he's willing to settle for the good reviews he got out of town with Olive in the role.

For him, that's good enough. Cheech is the artist; David is not. Allen said he had no specific actors in mind when he set out to cast "Bullets Over Broadway."

Despite the colorful nature of the characters and the settings, "Bullets Over Broadway" was photographed in Allen's characteristic dark tones.

"This is my seven or eighth picture with (Director of Photography) Carlo DiPalma and we always photograph comedies darkly," Allen said. "We've always shot richly and darkly — it's a style I've always liked."

Even the exterior scene in Central Park was shot in this style. "That was a typically flat, gray overcast day, the kind I like to shoot in New York," said Allen.

"We don't shoot outside on sunny days, and haven't in 20 years. On an overcast day like that, when you have flowers in the background — or any colors for that matter, you get a very rich saturation that you don't get on a sunny day."

As a result, the screen seems to burst with color as David pours out his passion for his leading lady in that scene

These outstanding hardwood performers knew how to get the job done night in and night out for their respective teams this fall and each one of them showed their mettle in the clutch.

Although our first team looks to be very strong on the interior at first glance, many of the all-area hoopers could show their versatility by going outside as well.

South Lyon's Cori Sutton and Lakeland's Stephanie Uballo were dominant post players on both ends of the court this year, while Milford's Julie Schmidt could score from anywhere and was a fearless performer for her team.

For the second straight year, Northville's Samantha Leger makes our first team. A junior, she led the Mustangs in nearly every offensive category this season.

Leger's close friend, Kelly Kearney of Novi, also landed a spot on our dream team. The Wildcat junior provided scoring, defense and leadership.

Yes, these girls can run the floor with the best of them and if you don't believe us, take a closer look at the East All-Area starting five and see if you think your game could handle the heat these players generate.

### CORI SUTTON

South Lyon, senior center

In her fourth year on the Lions varsity squad Sutton had to take on a new role this season.

As one of only two seniors she was the leader on the team and she took on the added responsibilities of being more of a ball-handler and jump shooter this year to go along with her low-post skills.

"Cori was the glue of our team," said coach Ron Shanks. "With such a young team, we depended on her a lot to hold things together."

Sutton led the Lions in scoring

(10 points per game) and blocks (51 for the year—a new team record) this fall. She ranks sixth on the Lions all-time scoring list (691 points) and second overall in career free throw percentage (64.2 percent).

### STEPHANIE UBALLE

Lakeland, junior forward/center

That little painted area in front of the hoop belonged to Uballo on both the offensive and defensive end this season.

Whether it was scoring, rebounding or blocking a big shot, Uballo took care of business in the lane for the Eagles. In her third season as a starter on the varsity level, Uballo averaged 14.5 points per game on 52 percent shooting from the floor while grabbing an average of 10.6 rebounds per contest. She also led the area in blocked shots, swatting away 93 attempts during the year.

She often had to overcome double and triple-teaming in the paint because Lakeland didn't have much else in the way of offensive weapons this season.

### JULIE SCHMIDT

Milford, senior forward

Intensity and determination were what Schmidt brought to the table for the young Milford team this season.

At only 5-7, she was one of the biggest players on the undersized Redskin team and she was forced to match up with bigger opponents for most of the year. Her relentless play underneath earned her all-conference honors as she averaged 12.9 points and 9.9 rebounds every time out.

"This is a kid who's completely intense," said Milford coach Don Palmer. "When she gets between those lines she's a totally different person."

A good leaper with excellent hands, Schmidt was also known for giving her teammates a lot to

handle in practice with her all-out style of play.

### KELLY KEARNEY

Novi, junior guard

One of the smartest players in the area, Kearney is also one of the most talented. According to coach Dennis Cichonski, the junior gave the Wildcats everything she had and then some.

"We looked for leadership and versatility from her game," he said. "She's a really hard-working player."

Kearney led Novi in scoring and averaged 13.9 points per game. She scored in double figures 16 of 21 games and had five performances of 20 or more points.

Scoring wasn't all she could do. Defensively, Kearney always drew the tough assignments and still averaged better than three steals a game.

### SAMANTHA LEGER

Northville, junior guard

After a great sophomore season, Leger raised her game a notch.

From passing to shot selection, the junior showed maturity. Leger averaged nearly four assists per game as she looked to dish the ball more than a year ago.

Coach Gary Schwan said her improvements came from an off-season of hard work. He added that it translated to a steadier season from his star.

"She really made a strong commitment in the off-season playing AAU," he said. "She showed flashes of brilliance as a sophomore. As a junior she became more consistent."

Leger was still Northville's first offensive option. Despite drawing continual double-teams, she scored 19 points per game on a variety of jump shots and drives to the basket. Leger was also one of the area's best rebounders at about nine per game.

She earned all-conference honors in the Western Lakes for the second straight year

### CHRISTINE EDWARDS

Novi, senior forward

A four-year varsity player, closed out her Novi career with 813 points—second only to former teammate Kristin Kenny. Edwards averaged 11.4 points in her last fall campaign.

"I think this was her most consistent year at Novi," coach Dennis Cichonski said.

Edwards filled many roles for Novi. She ran the offense at times at guard, but was also strong enough to play up front at forward and snag the second most rebounds on the squad.

Edward showed her defensive ability this year, too. She averaged better than two steals per game.

All of her accomplishments came despite being less than 100 percent physically. Cichonski said Edwards was troubled by an earlier shoulder injury as well as by other nagging injuries.

"She was very durable," he commented. "She played through all kinds of stuff."

This year was Edwards' third

straight on the All-Area second team.

### LAUREN METAJ

Northville, freshman guard

It isn't often that a freshman makes an All-Area squad. But, then again, it isn't often that a freshman of Metaj's ability comes along.

A highly heralded player, she lived up to expectations and more. In coach Gary Schwan's offense, Metaj was often a focal point.

In fact when the ball wasn't going to All Area first-teamer Samantha Leger, the Mustangs often sent it to the freshman. She responded well by averaging about 10 points per game.

Schwan said Metaj's even temperament was a big reason for her solid season.

"She (stays) at a good level and doesn't get over-excited," he added. "She's a steady player."

Metaj showed that she could shoot from the outside, run the break and come up with a variety of shots to score down low. But putting the ball through the hoop

wasn't all that she did this year.

Metaj developed into an excellent rebounder and averaged about 10 per game. Look for the freshman to be a fixture on the All-Area first team in years to come.

### JANIE AGENCY

South Lyon, junior forward

Agency really came into her own as a dominant inside force with the Lions this fall.

She and teammate Cori Sutton made a dynamic 1-2 punch in the paint for the South Lyon squad. Agency was a relentless performer on both the offensive and defensive glass as she hauled in more than 100 boards on both ends in '94. She led her team in rebounds, averaging 10.4 per game, and proved she could fill it up as well pouring in 9.8 points per contest.

She also led the team in field goal percentage connecting on 38.9 percent of her shots.

The only thing he had thought about up to that time was playing college football.

"I had no idea what I wanted to do or study," said Candela, who is one of five children.

By March of that year, Dino decided to join the Navy. He had considered other branches of the service but decided on the Navy on the advice of an uncle.

"It seemed like the right thing," he said. "The service had always been in the back of my mind."

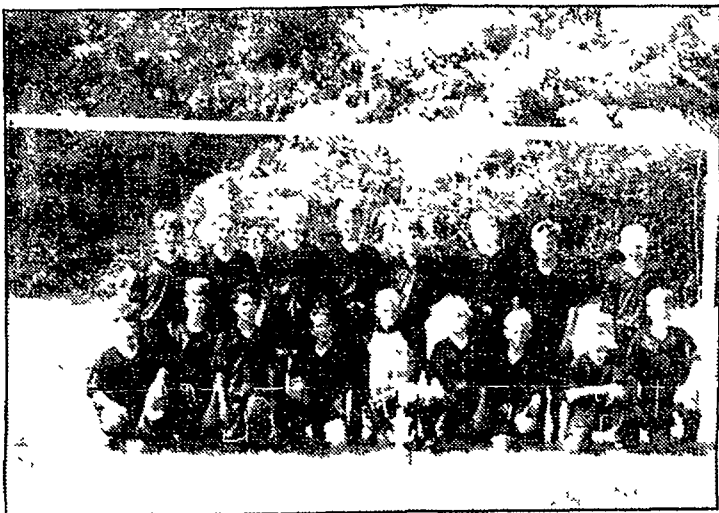
Boot camp, the six weeks or so the military takes to grind enlistees into shape, is the worst part of the service. Not for this Northville kid.

A year ago, the Mustang basketball mentor was surrounded by redwoods. Nearly a half dozen Northville High hoopsters stood 6-foot-5 or better. Heck, Josh Williams registered in at close to 7 feet.

Alas, the scenery has changed at the corner of Center Street and Eight Mile Road. This winter, the Mustangs will more closely resemble an average high school squad, at least in size, than the University of Michigan.

But that's all right with Taylor. Instead of slowing it down and using all that height, Northville will turn into a fast-paced, zippy, press-the-daylights-out-of-you ball club.

"This should fit into the style of play that I like," Taylor said. "This year we'll play up-tempo more. We won't be able to sit back and play half court because we won't match up."

Northville finished out the 1993-94 season with a 12-9 record. The Mustangs also finished eighth in the Western Lakes Activities Association.

"I don't think we played poorly," Taylor said. "But we had a couple of games we lost that we couldn't win. We had a lot of games that could've gone either way."

Kieran and Josh Williams, John Farrar, John Buser, Marc Chiasson and Neil Yackie are all gone from that squad.

"It was a talented and smart group of kids," said Taylor. "It'll be tough to replace them. They could play."

A total of 12 young men will make out the Mustang roster this winter. Only three return from last year's squad.

A number of players are up from last year's junior varsity.

Scott Anderson is another threat close to the basket. The senior, one of the returnees, will play small forward.

Taylor said he won't be counting on Anderson to carry the team in scoring. He said none of the Mustangs, in fact, are likely to average big numbers this year.

"We've got a lot of kids that can shoot," Taylor explained. "Our kids are all pretty equally talented. All of them will see playing time."

Having more than one offensive threat will be beneficial to the Mustangs.

"It leads to good balance," said Taylor.

Joining Anderson and Holman up front will be junior Ben Szostek. A 6-3 player, he can play any of the forward slots.

Senior Scott Lloyd is one of the better shooting Mustangs.

"He can step outside and shoot from 15 or 16 feet," said Taylor.

Garrett Carter will be around to provide toughness. Taylor described him as a scrappy player and the "kind that will dive for loose balls."

Playing up-tempo will necessitate Taylor going deep into his bench.

"We'll run these kids in and out during the game," he said. "They're all interchangeable. I don't know if we can give teams a lot of different looks."

Three players are vying for the point guard position.

Senior Jeff Zwiesler played varsity a year ago while junior Ancil Kersey was at JV. Mark Pomaroli joins the squad for the first time.

"They'll split time," Taylor said. "I don't know who will start."

Anthony DeBenedet will knock down the shooting guard job. Mark

Sander will also work in that position.

"They both do the same kinds of things," said Taylor.

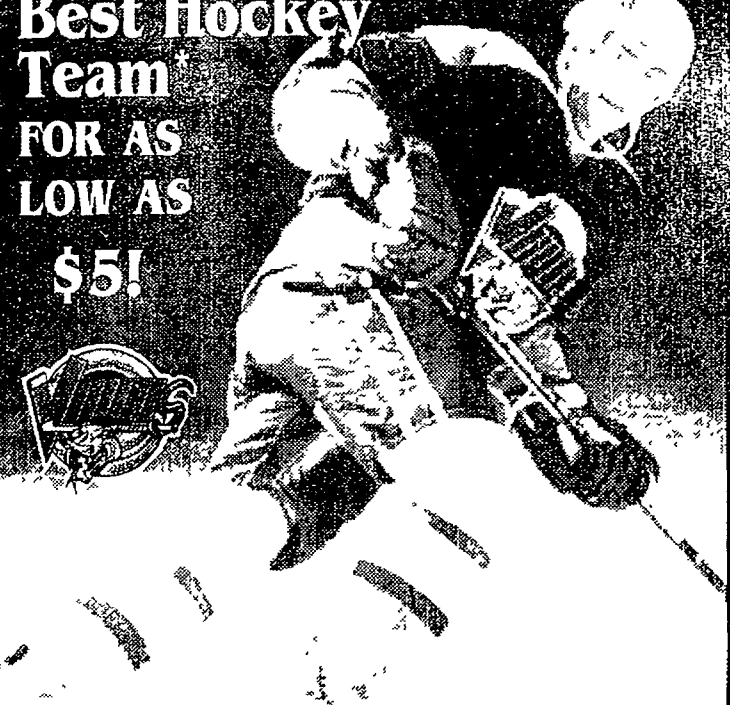

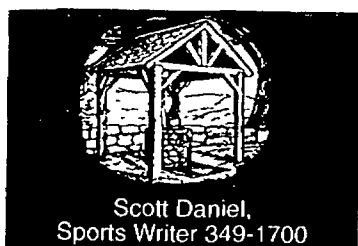

## Toys can be dangerous to young eyes

Christmas, that magical time of year, is fast approaching. As we peruse the endless toy aisles for the perfect gift, some consumer education tips on toy safety can help keep those little eyes healthy and bright.

Topping the list of dangerous toys on the market this season are:

- a toy pistol that fires hard, foam rubber "bullets" at 50 m.p.h.
- a toy helicopter with unprotected rotating blades
- a water balloon slingshot
- a Power Rangers product

Many of these toys have packaging claiming that the product is safe or soft. That can be far from the truth — a child has already lost an eye from the water balloon slingshot.

The helicopter's blades rotate fast enough to lift the toy 100 feet into the air; they could easily lacerate or puncture an eye. Launching it requires two hands and that puts the 20-inch-diameter blades dangerously close to a child's

eyes.

This year more than 56,000 children under age 15 were treated in hospital emergency rooms for injuries related to toys, according to the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission.

Today's toy departments have a plethora of toy pistols, rifles and rockets. When a toy's ammunition is hard, fast or heavy, the impact on the eye is severe and the damage intense. Even soft, suction cup-tipped darts can suck to the eye.

Parents can do a lot to reduce their children's eye-injury risk. Before you make your purchase, check on the following:

- Could the toy puncture the eye?
- Does the toy have sharp, protruding ends?
- How forcefully are the projectiles (balls, pellets, rockets, bullets, darts) fired?
- Could BB's be substituted for ammunition?
- How fast do the toy's moving parts rotate?
- Are they exposed?
- How close must a child be to moving parts?
- Does the toy contain liquid or powder that could get into the eyes?

It's important to keep in mind that young children have limited dexterity and coordination, which are necessary when playing with things such as mascara applicators or eye

shadow brushes.

Parents should test each gift a child receives for potential dangers. A toy that may be appropriate for a 10-year-old could be hazardous in the hands of a 5-year-old.

Careful supervision of children's play can greatly reduce the risk of injury with questionable toys.

Around the holidays, increased eye injuries also can occur because lights are often dimmed, furniture is rearranged and packaging or boxes clutter the floor.

Christmas trees also can be a danger for children and adults alike. Needles make for painful abrasions. Parents should get help and wear protective glasses during tree setup and take-down to keep the holidays happy.

## Can you sweat away extra pounds?

Steam and sauna baths have long been associated with gymnasiums and people interested in athletics and exercise. Many community recreation centers have elaborate steam and sauna rooms for people who believe they derive great benefits from profuse sweating.

The theory that you can sweat or melt away your fat is literally all wet.

Normally, when you lose one percent or more of your body weight through sweating, you seek to drink. Thus, weight losses induced by sweating are rapidly regained by drinking.

Prolonged exposure to extreme heat or humidity may cause a dangerous rise in body temperature, with related circulatory problems. These dangers are compounded after exercise, when body temperature is already elevated.

Because of the high humidity in steam rooms, sweat cannot evaporate to cool the body — and that's the purpose of sweat. Without this cooling effect, body temperature may rise to dangerously high levels.

Saunas, on the other hand, result in less heat stress because the humidity is kept low, allowing sweat to evaporate.

Circulatory problems may include a rapid fall in blood pressure with a decreased flow to the heart. Results can be sudden fainting when you stand up to leave the sauna and heart rhythm disturbances. The elderly and those with heart problems should use extreme caution — or avoid these baths entirely.

Although steam and sauna do little to improve fitness or reduce body fat stores, many people do find them enjoyable and relaxing. Furthermore, recent studies have shown that the heat may bring about significant decreases in muscle tension and relieve nervous tension.

These baths also may soothe sore, aching muscles, relieve symptoms of arthritis and bursitis, and promote a calm and restful sleep.

Take these safety precautions in steam and sauna baths:

- Lie down. Don't sit.
- Remain only for short periods, don't try to "tough it out."
- Wear no clothing which restricts sweating, the body's evaporative heat loss mechanism.
- Don't use with alcohol or drugs.
- If you feel dizzy or weak, leave immediately.

9. I've heard that after vigorous exercise, your metabolism remains elevated for some time. Is that true?

A Yes. After a vigorous exercise bout, your metabolism may remain elevated as long as six hours. This is beneficial in the control of body weight, not only for the calories burned during exercise, but also because a considerable caloric expenditure continues following exercise.

While boot camp wasn't a problem, the Navy did do a lot in disciplining him. Candela was stationed in California for a time and studied basic electricity and electronics.

For seven or eight hours a day, Dino sat in a classroom learning and becoming a better student than he was in high school. The service, he said, made the transition into the college classroom an easy one.

"As hard as the Navy was and as much as I disliked it at times," he added, "I have to thank the Navy for setting me on the right path for my career."

Candela is studying electrical engineering at Wayne State. He has hopes of working in computer design when he graduates in a year or so.

"I do well in school now," said Candela, who carries about a B average. "It's because of the Navy."

While academics were paramount during his six years in the service, Dino never forgot about athletics. He played competitive softball and wrestled.

"I wanted to prove what an athlete I was and could be," he said.

With about two years remaining in the Navy, Candela decided he would try his hand at football again when he got out.

"I was waiting for my day to come," he commented.

And it did.

Candela started classes at Wayne in the winter of 1992 and made the Tartar football team as a walk-on in the spring. Fortunately, for Dino, the school cleaned house that spring firing the old coach and hiring Brian VanGorder to run the

program.

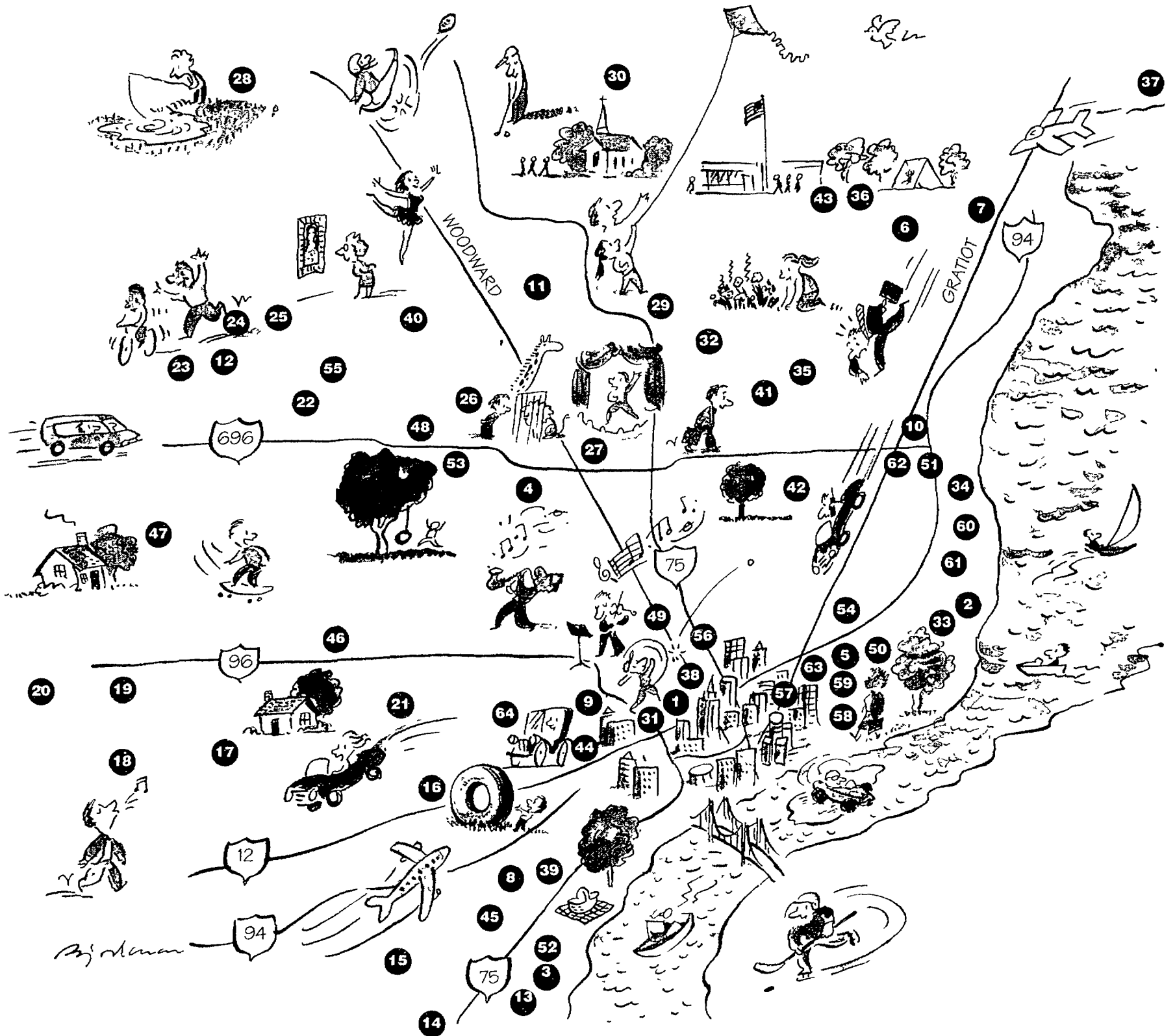

### There's a need for more retirement housing

"Many community planning leaders throughout the country are missing the boat when it comes to retirement housing. This is a steadily growing and important segment of our population, but most areas have little to offer in suitable housing."

John Anderson, Realtor and president-elect of his regional Association of Realtors, expressed that view while pondering one of the most profound "missed opportunities" in today's real estate marketplace.

The only types of housing many areas offer this growing niche of home buyers are condos, mobile homes and small older houses. Yet many of these areas have the basic elements desired by most retirees

— a small town atmosphere, offering safety, friendliness, clean air, minimal crime and interesting places to go and see. But little is being done to provide these folks with the special housing they need.

Retirees have a lot in common with first-time buyers in the type of home they seek, but each has its own distinctive criteria.

Individuals and couples entering their retirement years comprise a growing segment of home buyers in the current market. Today's retirees are generally more wealthy and healthier than they were a few years ago, it was revealed in a recent study. They have longer life expectancies than previous generations.

### The Hemlock spans grace and practicality

Round columns support a welcoming front porch that spans the front of the Hemlock and wraps around to the left. On the second level, two decorative columns flank a dormer with a graceful arched window.

The entry is vaulted to the second floor ceiling and brightened by the overhead dormer. An open balustrade on the right curves up to the second floor where a landing overlooks the foyer. Three bedrooms, each with a built-in desk, share a compartmentalized bathroom on this level. A linen closet, two storage closets and a clothes chute to the utility room below, line the hallway.

Stately columns similar to those on the exterior mark the passageways that separate the living room, entry and dining room from each other and from the informal living areas at the back of the home. The shape of the hearth mirrors bay windows in the dining room and living room.

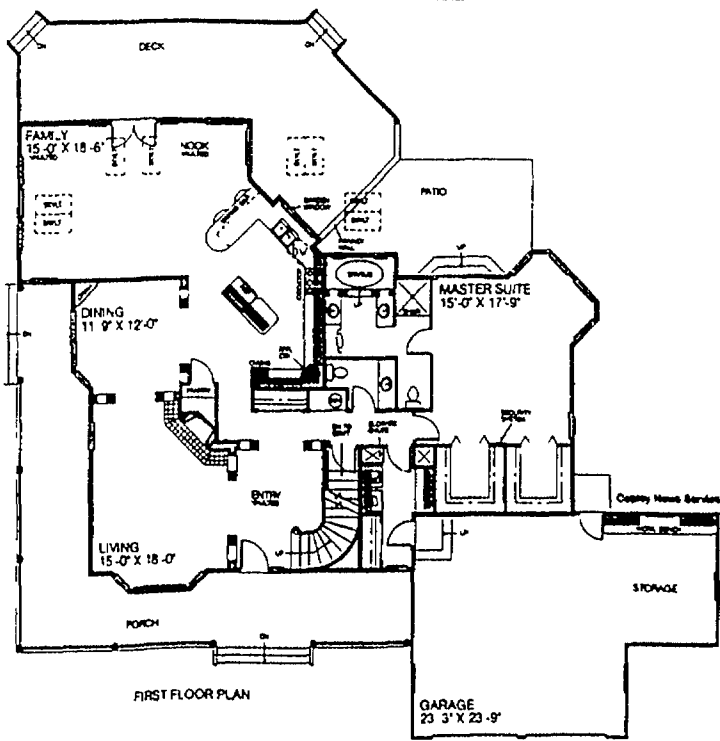
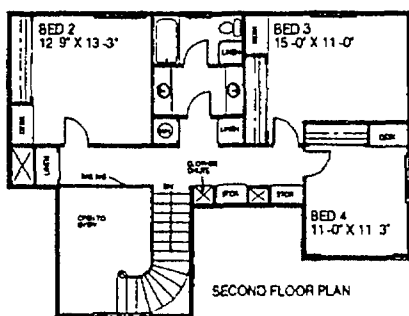
The family room/kitchen is large and bright. In the family room, skylights add to the illumination provided by windows and French doors. 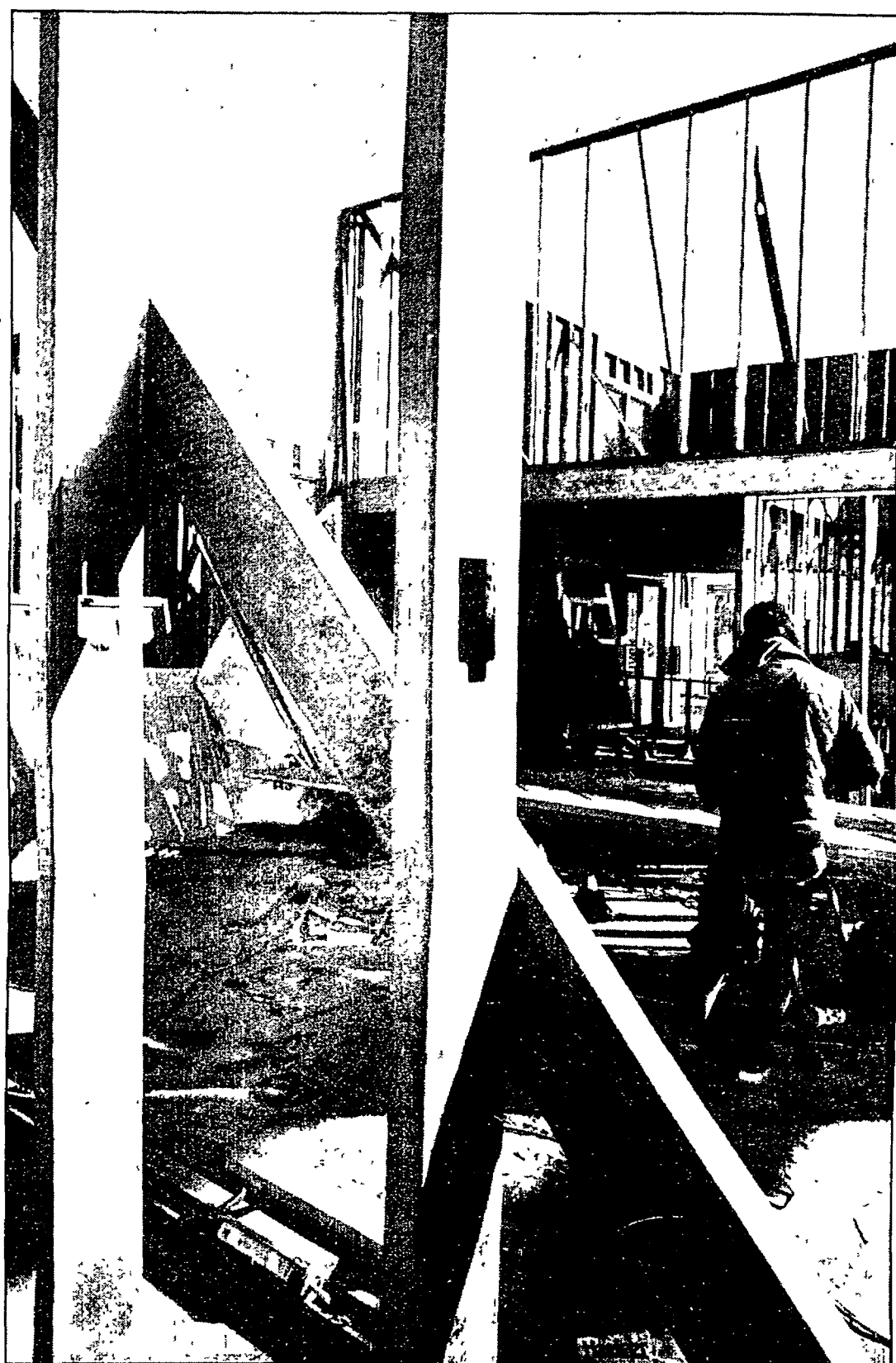

## STEELING HOME



One hero emerging from Hurricane Andrew has gone largely unsung.

In the aftermath of the destructive Andrew, the homes that weathered the storm best were those built with metal studs.

So dramatic were the differences between how metal- and wood-framed homes made it through the storm that the Florida Legislature is considering banning wood-framed homes, according to Jim Cisek, a builder who is putting up a metal frame home in Brighton Township.

And it isn't that metal is inherently stronger than wood; the secret is how the pieces are put together.

"It's all in the fastening," Cisek said. "The metal doesn't make the house stronger — the strength of the metal is comparable to wood — but the connections are stronger with metal parts."

Those connections, as well as the soaring price of lumber, make the choice to use metal for residential home framing a logical one.

Commercial buildings have been enjoying the benefits of metal frames for years, but until recently, the price was too prohibitive for residential construction.

Victor Lisabeth of Lisabeth Builders in Pinckney put up the first home in Livingston County using metal floor joists.

That home, built for the Home Builders Association of Livingston County's 1993 Cavalcade of Homes, was a big draw for other builders during the show.

"It helped educate people," Lisabeth said. "Building the home was an educational experience, as well."

Some of the advantages, Lisabeth said, include the fact that there is no shrinkage or warping, like with wood, and that floors stay straight.

"There's virtually no deflection with metal," Lisabeth said. "Floors with metal joists are twice as strong as wood."

The people who purchased Lisabeth's Cavalcade home are happy with it, and Lisabeth said that more and more builders are opting for metal framing.

## Using anti-desiccants

### GARDENING

Q. Several of my conifers suffered winter damage last year. I would like to use an anti-desiccant spray to protect my plants. Can you give me some advice on the subject?

A. Anti-desiccants are emulsions of either latex, wax or plastic that are sprayed on the above-ground parts of a plant to form a protection. This film seals the plant's pores and prevents excessive moisture loss from drying winter and early spring winds or sun.

Many evergreens suffer moisture loss when the roots are unable to supply moisture to the plant because the ground is frozen or very dry. For example, broadleaf evergreens such as holly or boxwood are especially vulnerable. Others that suffer from cold-weather damage are hemlocks, pines, yews and junipers.

Anti-desiccants should be applied before severe winter sets in, and they can also be reapplied several more times throughout the winter at monthly intervals, especially if snow cover is light. Keep in mind snow acts as a protective blanket.

The initial application of

anti-desiccants should be in late November or early December, depending upon the area you live in. The protective coating will disappear in the spring when new growth begins.

Using burlap is another way to protect your plants from severe winds; the wrappings can be used along with anti-desiccants.

### NEMATODE TROUBLE

For those having nematode trouble, I suggest a winter planting of perennial cereal rye, either Elbon or Wintermore variety.

Nematodes get into the fibrous root system of the plant, and the poor plant cannot escape and literally starves to death. The rye can be plowed under for green manure later.

This is the "nonchemical" route on nematode control.

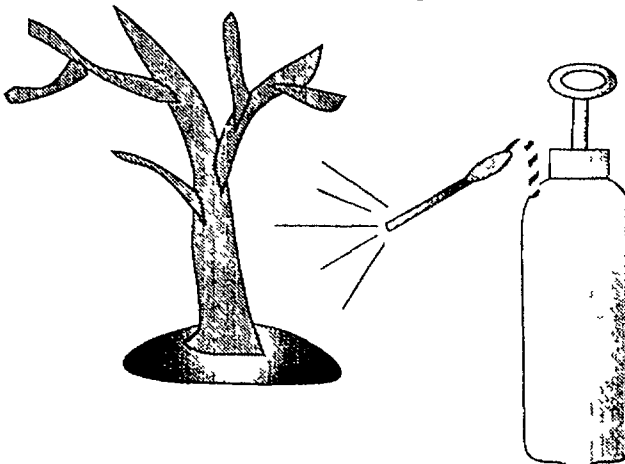

However, that hasn't yet translated into a large number of metal frame homes under construction in Livingston County.

"I don't see it becoming real popular in Livingston County yet," said John Rudzinskiy of Paragon Builders. "But as the price of lumber goes up, we might be headed in that direction."

Lisabeth estimated that there are perhaps a dozen metal frame homes in Livingston County.

One drawback all the builders see with metal framing is the time necessary to properly fasten the pieces together.

"If it used to take us five weeks to put up a wood frame home, it will take seven weeks with metal framing," Cisek said.

That additional time can make any savings on the cost of materials a wash, but Lisabeth said that he would still recommend metal framing.

"It's a better deal," Lisabeth said.

Cisek said that metal framing is changing the home-building industry.

"It used to be that 98 percent of the homes built were wood framed," Cisek said. "In two years we expect that 65 percent of the homes built will be metal-framed."

And that translates into a lot of plusses, including a possible savings on insurance costs for metal-framed homes.

"Insurance companies are looking at giving discounts for metal studs," Cisek said. "It's just a better way to build homes."

## ADVANTAGES OF STEEL OVER WOOD

• **COST EFFECTIVE** — With the soaring price of lumber, builders estimate that homeowners can save about 8 percent on their rough home package.

• **ECCOLOGICAL** — Nearly two-thirds of the steel used in building is manufactured from recycled materials.

• **LESS WASTE** — Steel beams and studs are cut to size, eliminating the need to trim as with wood.

• **STRONGER** — Since the steel is screwed into place, rather than nailed, it makes for stronger connections.

• **MORE USEABLE SPACE IN BASEMENTS** — Since steel joists can span the entire width and/or length of a home, there is no need for support columns in the basement.

• **LESS FLEXING** — Unlike wood, steel won't warp or sag, eliminating creaks in floors and buckles in walls and ceilings.

• **BUG-LESS** — Fire, termite and carpenter ant-proof.

## There's a need for more retirement housing for the 90s

educated, still married and, for the first time, have pensions, investments and equity to provide financial security," it was noted in the study sponsored by three publications: Money magazine, "50 Fabulous Places to Retire in America" (Career Press), and "Retirement Places Rated" (Prentice Hall Press).

"The most dramatic change among retirees is that many are relocating to other parts of the country," the study said. "Unlike their parents and grandparents who spent their last years living in or near their children's homes, the U.S. Census Bureau reports that more than a half-million adults age 55 and over move out-of-state to a retirement home every year."

Another major change is that relocating upon retirement was traditionally a privilege of the rich, according to the report.

"Now it's the middle class that doesn't summer where it winters. For those on a fixed income moving to an area where the living costs and taxes are manageable is the best strategy for financial survival."

In this respect, areas with high home prices pose a problem. But with a growing proportion of retirees who can afford more expensive housing, many of these areas offer the precise type of

lifestyle most seniors desire.

Using the study data, a list of "top 21 retirement places in the United States" was compiled by the staff of Real Estate Investment Journal, a publication of Century 21 Real Estate Corp.

Because of the high cost of housing, only one of those locations was in California — Palm Springs — where the average cost of homes is from \$100,000 to \$150,000 and where 26 percent of residents are age 65 or over, according to the study.

The recommended location with the lowest housing cost was Aiken, S.C. (population 20,500), where average home prices range from \$40,000 to \$85,000 — 10 percent of residents are age 65 or older.

The most expensive of the locations was Sedona, Ariz. (population 7,700), where average home prices range from \$150,000 to \$200,000.

As retirees become more financially capable and increase in numbers, we'll be hearing more about special housing and mortgage financing plans for this important segment of our population.

## Preparing your mower for winter

Always completely shut off the engine before draining the oil.

Scrape off all debris and dirt from under the deck and other areas. Check carefully for any broken, damaged or loose parts as you clean the engine.

Place a little oil in each cylinder. Then select a dry, protected spot to store your lawn mower. Elevate the machine on blocks so that its weight is not resting on the tires all winter.

These precautions should protect your equipment during the off-season.

### THANKSGIVING FLOWERS

The brisk Thanksgiving season is a happy time for our family, and to me no occasion is complete without an array of flowers. I set to work (or play) gathering and arranging flowers so that everyone can share my festive mood. I mix and match. If I'm lucky, I'll have a few of the last summer roses. Then there are the chrysanthemums in many colors, but I prefer the lovely bronzes and oranges that bloom through Christmas.

If you want year-round bouquets, try drying flowers and foliage. The best flowers to use are artemisia, strawflowers, yarrow or honesty. Pick one or more and hang them in a dark, dry room for two weeks.

Meantime, cut some small branches of beech, leucothoe and bayberry. Put them in a solution of one-third glycerin and two-thirds

water. After six days, they will turn dark and can be removed from the solution. Combined with the dried flowers, they make a lovely bouquet for the holidays.

Thanksgiving makes us think of the Pilgrims at Plymouth Colony, where life (the first years) was cruel and basic, a constant struggle against great odds. Only half the Colonists survived the first winter. Today's life is a cinch in comparison.

Meeting day-to-day requirements of food, shelter and clothing was no easy task. Gardening of course, was of basic importance for a better quality of life and means of survival. The number of different vegetables commonly grown by Colonists was small; nevertheless, they wasted no time in developing their vegetable gardens with the help of the Indians.

Gov. William Bradford in a 17th century poem, listed the crops grown there:

"All sorts of roots and herbs in gardens grow."

Pumpkins, carrots, turnips are what you'll sow.

Onions, melons, cucumbers, radishes,

Skirrets, beets, colworts and fat cabbages.

# Those Interested In Remodeling Should Know. . .

**R**emodeling is currently a 100+ Billion dollar a year industry, it only makes sense to spend a little time on the "particulars" of the business.

Although that figure above is impressive, projections for future growth in the industry are even more so. It is estimated that by the year 2000, Americans will spend almost \$200 billion annually to fix up, add on to, and remodel their homes. The typical "customer" in the remodeling business is no longer looking to merely add a basic 24x20 family room, or have you install Marlite over the old drywall in the bathroom. The widespread availability of upper end housing products combined with their new affordability have allowed many

homeowners to keep the location they've come to know and love while completely changing the face and livability of the home itself. This is reinforced by the fact that 28% of homeowners who recently remodeled did so to increase the

homes value, and 33% of them did so as an alternative to moving.

The overall quality of the work force has improved as more and more businesses begin to specialize in one phase of the project, and public awareness forces out the unlicensed, unqualified workers as customers begin to shop more intelligently and with greater caution for their remodeling contractor.

For those of you who wonder just where all of this "value" comes from, the results of a recent survey

of 240 real estate agents in 60 cities may lend some insight. The survey asked what percentage of the cost of a specific remodeling project might be recouped if the house were sold within a year, and the numbers are good news for all:

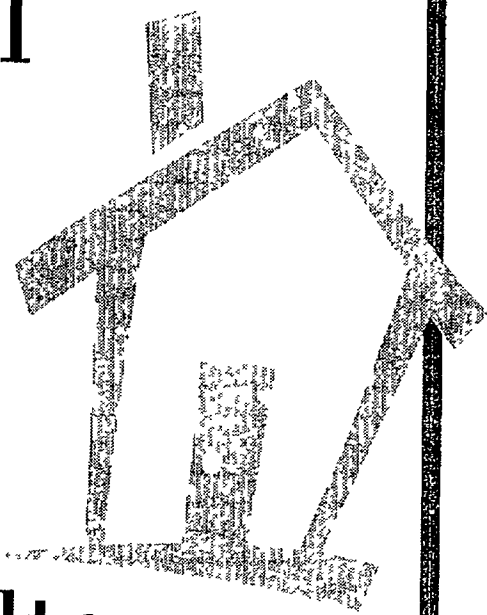

The only caveat to all of this good news is to the homeowners who will be spending all of this money. Intelligent planning with the aid of a professional remodeler is the best way for homeowners to guarantee the vision they seek becomes the reality of their "new" home. They shouldn't commit to spending thousands of dollars with a contractor they haven't thoroughly checked out; or make the all too common mistake of a 5-10% spread in the estimate being the deciding factor as to who they will hire. As the facts seem to indicate, while quality costs a little more, it is worth every cent!

# HOUSING INDUSTRY HIGHLIGHTS

**F**annie Mae's third annual survey of 1,400 homeowners and renters indicates that Americans overwhelmingly want to own their own homes. # Remodeling and Redecorating With Ceramic Tile

Ancient Egyptians and Romans used them in their homes and baths. Ceramic tiles in brilliant colors and unique patterns still beautify the floors, walls, and ceilings of cathedrals, temples, and palaces built many centuries ago.

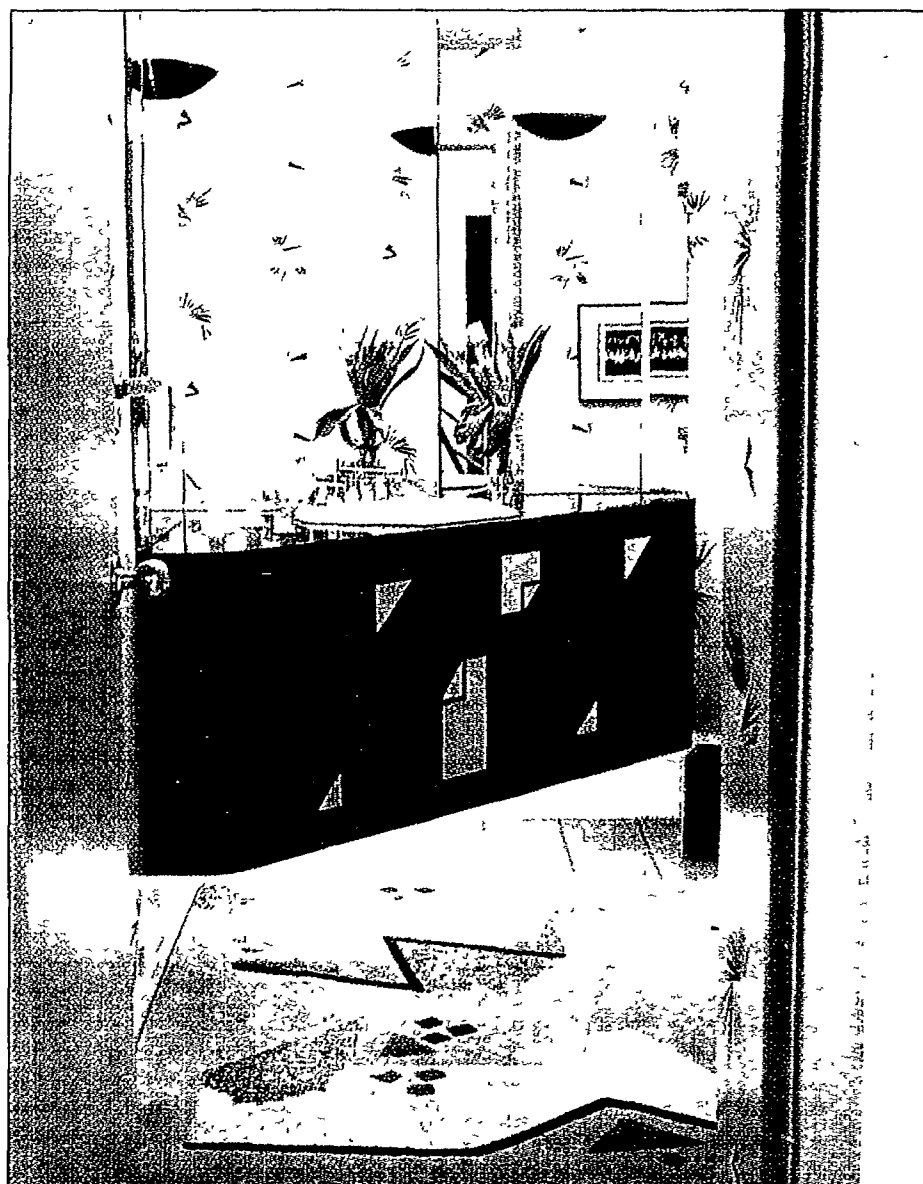
For remodeling, there is no surfacing material with quite the credentials of ceramic tile. It is highly decorative, durable, and adds measurable value to your home. You will find tile soil- and moisture-resistant and easy to maintain. Because of its versatility, there is no limit to the variety of styles and designs you can create. Tile adapts just as well to a sleek, contemporary setting as it does to a traditional home, a cottage style, or even a log cabin.

Tile is produced domestically and also comes from Portugal, Italy, Spain, Mexico and other tile manufacturing locales. The tiles from these countries reflect colorful and unique cultures. They have brought us way beyond the days of "white and beige", and have captured the interest and imagination of the American public. According to the Tile Council of America, the use of tile in the United States has nearly doubled over the last decade.

Not only are people using colorful and decorative tiles more than ever, they are finding lots of new ways to use them. Formerly relegated mainly to the

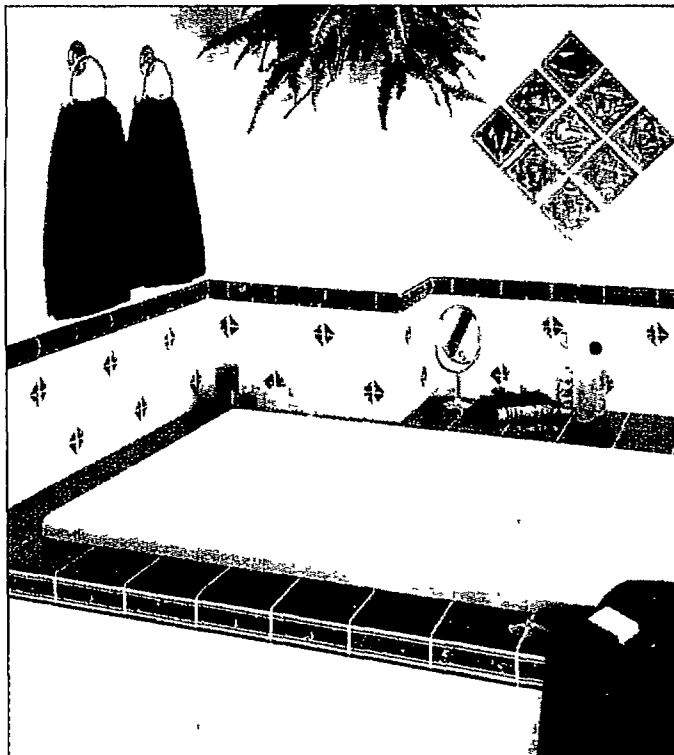

kitchen and bath, we are seeing ceramic in foyers, sunrooms, home gyms, countertops, surrounding hot tubs, as borders around windows and mirrors—anywhere people seek to create an intriguing, custom environment.

The place to see these tiles is in a ceramic tile showroom. Manufacturers, distributors, and dealers, as well as some licensed tile contractors have showrooms displaying a great variety. In addition to individual tiles, you can often see actual installations. It is also helpful to lay out patterns with a showroom consultant. The staff can answer your questions and advise you in choosing your selections. You can usually check out samples to try out at home for color, size and compatibility.

You should find out from talking to the showroom consultant or through your own research what type of tile will serve best in the area in which you will have it installed. Some tiles will be multi-use, while others are specific for certain locations because of the type of tile body or glaze. Wall tiles, for instance, are usually thinner and lighter in weight. They may have

decals or handpainted designs and delicate glazes which are excellent for wall use but would be easily scratched if used on the floor. Floor tiles generally are made of heavier, more dense material. Their glazes are made to



withstand foot traffic. Sometimes they are textured and some types, including quarry tile and some porcelains have no glaze at all.

The tile you choose may depend on your remodeling schedule. Tiles that sell in volume are usually stocked by the distributor and will be readily available. Others may not be in stock and need to be ordered. The

wait on these may be two weeks or longer. The consultant will know the length of time it will take for your order to arrive. By starting the selection process early you will be assured of having your tile in time.

Whatever is selected, achieving a finished look can be a challenge. The professional tile setter has the knowledge and experience to measure the job and order all the right pieces. He or she will know what kind of surface is needed underneath and how it should be prepared to receive the adhesive and what sort of grout to use. Cutting, lining up grout joints, making corners and edges fit, all takes considerable skill.

If you decide to do the job yourself, a very helpful tool is the **HANDBOOK FOR CERAMIC TILE INSTALLATION** published by the Tile Council of America. It will provide installation instructions in detail with illustrations. The handbooks are available from tile distributors.

The secret to the success of your remodeling project is research and careful planning. Using quality materials that will perform and look beautiful for many years is important. Ceramic tile should be your surface finish of choice.

# The Advantages Of Using A Humidifier

As the cold air of winter approaches, turning up your heat will become a daily event. But as you turn up your heat, the amount of moisture in the air is on a rapid decrease. In fact, indoor winter air can be drier than a desert.

Not only is dry air uncomfortable, but it can cause many problems for you and your home. Doctors often mention dry air as one of the many causes for nose, throat and other physical aggravations. In cases where excessive dry air has been the cause of personal physical aggravations, doctors have prescribed whole-house humidification. Furnishings are protected with proper humidity too—reducing the damage effects of heated, parched air upon everything from your wood floors to your plants.

"Humidifiers can be adapted to 90% of all furnaces," states Joe Burke of Air Conditioning Engineers.

Cost of a humidifier can range between \$195-\$400, depending on the size of your home. Installation of a humidifier only takes about an hour and half.

New homes do not usually come with a humidifier, so make sure to ask your builder when pricing your new home.

Having the proper humidity in your homes means comfort, personal well being, preservation of your home and furnishings and energy savings.

design. It will originate from a clear definition of what is to be accomplished, who the users are, what special needs do they have, what innovative opportunities exist with the existing space, what products are available, etc..

A bathroom for small children who require parents assistance to use the toilet and bathtub will need to address special needs and safety issues not relevant to adults. Children may need lower shower head heights or personal shower heads in bathtubs. Vanity top heights should be lowered, have height adjustment features, or allow for storage of a sturdy step stool. Vanities should have smooth rounded edges and easily graspable door pulls. Easily cleanable, non-slip surfaces should be used on the floors and in the tubs. Temperature control valves should be used on the sinks and tubs to prevent scalding. Single handle water controls faucets facilitate easier water mixing. Kids baths can have night lights with motion detectors and timers to turn off lights.

Master bathrooms are now showcasing imported Italian marble tiles and restored brass antique light fixtures, frameless eurostyled shower doors, hand painted sinks and hand rubbed wood cabinetry. They are becoming more and more personalized to allow busy executives to catch the morning news and stock reports on TV monitors while brushing their teeth and to pamper stressed parents in the evening with steam showers and hot, soothing whirlpool baths while viewing the aquarium or fireplace. They have separate vanities and toilet spaces, urinals and bidets. They come equipped with heated towel bars and hidden hair dryer holsters, sound systems and automatic fragrance dispensers. Master bathrooms are being renovated with cathedral ceilings, custom windows, lighted make-up mirrors and leaded glass.

The complexity of bathroom renovation projects vary from wallpaper, toilet, sink and faucet replacements to complete demolition and removal with wall relocations and additions. The costs of construction will vary with the degree of complexity and luxury. The addition of windows impacting the exterior brick work, the relocation of fixtures requiring the removal of ceramic tile floors and cast iron piping, the change of a wall which has plaster crown molding work will all have cost consequences. The level of luxury can quickly become the budget buster. The cost of ceramic tile can jump from \$150.00 to \$1500.00, the cost of a shower door can climb from \$400.00 to \$4,000.00 all for want of beauty and luxury. Rain bar body washes and imported granite counters can tip the top on any budget. Material specification decisions and the amount and complexity of the work will vary overall project costs from a few thousand to fifty thousand dollars. However, bathroom additions and renovations have high percentages of return ranging from 85% to 100% and more. They are high profile areas of a home and get special scrutiny during home purchase decisions.

A bathroom remodeling project can be a great adventure and a rewarding experience whether you do the work yourself or you employ an architect and builder to help. Careful comprehensive planning, quality design, and informed cost decisions are critical to any project success.
