By the end of April the district's citizen committees on enhancement millage, bond and technology will have made recommendations to the board of education on whether to place before voters key questions having to do with providing funds for the district's

Before the district can pose the

possibility of additional funding to the community, however, a number of questions must be addressed: Should the district hold a miliage election, a bond Issue election or both? And if so. how much revenue should be

Although committees are still in the preliminary stages of planning. voters could be asked to approve a \$30-\$35 million bond issue to construct a new high school or \$20-\$25 million to build a new middle school. In addition, David Bolitho, assistant superintendent for administrative services, has made a list of infrastructure needs totaling \$8 million that could be included in a bond issue Bringing no request before voters is another option the district could decide on

In addition, enhancement millage committee members are wrestling with the idea of holding an election and asking voters to approve a maximum of three mills for the next two years - which would provide roughly \$2 7 million over that time.

Residents with \$200,000 homes would pay \$300 in additional taxes on a 3-mill increase.

The community will not have to wait much longer for the answers. The technology committee will make recommendations for computer, software and other resource upgrades to the board at its March 13 meeting. The enhancement committee will make its recommendation near the end of March

## Suspect faces life in alleged torture case

(Editor's note: The name of the alleged victim in the following story as well as her place of residence in Northville Township have been omitted to preserve the woman's identity.)

It's the kind of horror story that's not supposed to happen in a town like this.

But it has, according to Northville Township police.

A Detroit man stands accused of sexually abusing, torturing and intending to murder his girlfriend, a township resident. Keenan Lewis Wells, 25, was arraigned Valentine's Day morning in 35th District Court on four felony charges in connection with the Feb. 8 incident.

Wells is accused of first-degree criminal sexual conduct (CSC) during the commission of a felony. of using a weapon and causing personal injury during the CSC and of assault with intent to murder. Each charge carries a maximum penalty of life imprisonment

Judge John MacDonald entered a plea of not guilty for Wells and scheduled a pretrial hearing in the case for Feb 17 Township police requested bail to be set at \$250,000 cash McDonald, however, agreed to set bond at 10 percent of \$250,000, requiring the suspect to post \$25,000 cash in order to be freed. To date, he has not posted bond and remains in

the Wayne County Jail.

The woman involved is 23 years old. She told police that Wells systematically beat, burned and otherwise abused her over a ninehour period after discovering what he thought was evidence of her seeing another man The grisly culmination came when he allegedly heated up a pair of scissors and used them to burn his tattooed name off of her genitals.

While doing so, the alleged victim told investigators, he would sometimes be "really cheery and happy and just, you know, la, la, la, real spunky like everything was

At other times, however, Wells was verbally abusive and even accused her of "violating" him through her alleged unfaithfulness, she claimed

Wells repeatedly threatened to kill her, the woman sald, and twice promised to take her for a "trunk ride" - locking her in the trunk of his car for a couple of days "to teach me a lesson.

At the arraignment Wells' attor ney John McColskey characterized the charges as "a case of prosecutorial overcharging

Wells himself surrendered to police Tuesday morning. In an initial phone conversation with town ship Detective John Werth last week, he said that he and his girl friend 'just had a little misunder standing

Replacing it has been high on the department's to-do list for years. Police union officials say township residents or emergency personnel could be hurt or killed if the radio dies out during a critical incident. While members of the board agree that a new radio's needed, they've bumped it down the priority ladder in the past because of the cost - as much as

\$300,000 \$400,000.

This time around, however, it appears that the purchase will go through In November, the trustees agreed to form a committee to work on the radio. Last month, the board authorized the committee to seek bids for the new radio and to spend up to \$2,000 for an electronics consultant.

The consultant was to evaluate what the township would need in a new dispatch radio system The board received the report last week, prepared by the Ohio firm of Steiger, Hurrary & Associates. It advised that the township buy an updated communications system to meet both present and future



## City begins procedure to condemn vacant house

The City of Northville has initiated formal condemnation procedures on a home on Carrington Street that was earlier deemed unfit for human habitation.

On Feb. 6, the city officially posted its intent to condemn the home at the corner of South Ely and Carrington streets.

The condition of the structure has been of concern to surrounding neighbors ever since the home was boarded up back in November. If condemnation proceeds, residents could see the home demolished by the end of August.

"This is the first official step in the process," said City Manager Gary Word.

A 50-year-old woman, Sandra Myers, was found dead in the home as a result of carbon monox-

ide poisoning from a faulty water heater in the basement. The home was in an advanced state of disrepair, with a large amount of animal feces found littered throughout the house. Seven dead cats and more than nine live ones were also discovered in the home.

At the time of the woman's death, the building department boarded-up the structure and declared it unfit for human habitation. Since then, city and police officials have received numerous phone calls inquiring about a solution to the situation. Since the woman's death, the city has been working with the her two sons to clean up the structure.

The heirs to the property now have 30 days to initiate repairs or clean-up of the home. If nothing happens within the next couple of weeks, the city will move forward

to demolish the home.

"We got nowhere with the sons. No action has been taken," said head building inspector Mick Kruszewski. "So we initiated the procedure."

If no effort to bring the home up to code has been made 30 days after the condemnation posting. the city must wait six months. If the heirs to the property still make no attempt to sell, clean or repair the home after six months, the city will begin soliciting bids for demo-

Kruszewski estimates that demolition costs could range from \$10,000-\$12,000.

Once the structure has been demolished, the heirs will still own the land and have the option to sell. If the land is sold, the new owners would owe the city the costs of demolition.

## Stalker pleads guilty to charge, but moves in with his former victim

A man accused of stalking his ex-wife has been convicted of that charge but is living in the woman's home in Northville Township.

The man, 60, of Oak Park, on Friday agreed to a plea bargain in Wayne County Circuit Court. He was charged with two counts of aggravated stalking, a felony in Michigan carrying a maximum sentence of five years. In return for the county prosecutor's office agreeing to drop those charges, the man agreed to plead guilty to one count of misdemeanor stalking and received a year's probation.

In addition, the man is now living with his ex-wife in her home, township police said. That's despite the fact that she obtained two judicial restraining orders preventing him from having any contact with her. To date police have received no notification that the orders have been rescinded.

The event is one more unexpected twist in a story that has many strange angles.

Last year, the man's ex-wife filed a number of complaints with township police. She said her exhusband had been repeatedly harassing her by calling and driving by her home. On one occasion, she added, he broke in and on another he allegedly chased a member of her family.

The man was arrested and arraigned in October on the first aggravated stalking charge, pled not guilty and posted a \$1,000 cash bail.

He was released, but then allegedly continued to stalk his exwife. She filed two more police complaints in the two weeks after he was given bail on the first charge. That led township police to arrest him on a second stalking charge when he appeared in court for a hearing on the first count.

His bail was then set at \$250,000 cash. He was unable to post it and was taken to the Wayne County Jail, where he stayed for several weeks. A judge then lowered his bail to 10 percent of \$10,000. He posted the \$1,000 and has been free ever since.

After he was freed on bond, the woman filed another complaint, claiming he drove his car into her driveway on one occasion

## **Planning** appointee approved

it's almost routine now; another meeting of the board of trustees in Northville Township, another debate about an appointment.

Last month, the trustees disagreed about Supervisor Karen Baja's choice for a seat on the Northville Parks & Recreation Commission. Last Thursday, the board debated but eventually approved her candidate for an open spot on the township planning commission.

Some of the trustees were reluctant to agree to Maureen Turner's appointment because she works for the City of Northville's contracted engineering consultant firm, McNeely & Lincoln, Her job, some said, would present a conflict of interest if as a commissioner she had to consider a plan for a township project in which McNeely was involved.

The board wants to avoid another situation such as exists with commission chair Dick Allen. His son is employed by Robert Leighton Associates, a land design firm. Several developers have used that firm on township projects.

On those projects, Allen remains a voting member of the commission but steps down as its chair. He has said that several legal opinions he's received indicate that the situation is not a conflict of interest for him.

Baja said Turner had agreed to abide by the township's ethical requirements and would withdraw from any commission activity where a conflict existed.

The connection to Northville City, she added, shouldn't keep Turner off the commission.

That wasn't enough at first for Trustee Russ Fogg, who suggested tabling the appointment. He said he wanted to question Turner about her opinions on land development and he was supported by Trustee Barbara Strong O'Brien.

The Salem Historical Society is planning a field trip on Saturday. Feb. 25, to Amherstburg, Ontario, in celebration of Black History Month. While in Amherstburg, they plan to visit the North American Black Historical Museum and Cultural Centre.

Black history in this region has been largely ignored although it is not totally nonexistent. The John Lewis family of Salem was probably the community's most prominent black family in the latter part of the 19th century. Lewis himself served as a soldier during the Civil War and settled in this area afterwards. According to his son, Frank, he was Michigan's last Civil War veteran to die when he passed away Jan. 14, 1941.

Born at Glen Robbins, Ohio, on Nov. 14, 1845, to a free-born Virginian. Berry Lewis and a recently freed slave, Lucy Clanton, he was one of eight children. Although they were free, Berry Lewis decided to relocate his family in Ontario because of the racial turmoil engulfing the nation. When the war between the states erupted, John tried to enlist but his age, 16, and race kept him from early service. Once Detroit established a "colored" regiment, John attempted again. He was rejected due to his age and small stature. Not one to give up, he went on to Pontlac where he became one of the 102nd Regiment on Aug. 23, 1864.

After the war John married Evangeline Smith, also of Ontario, and migrated to this area. They had eight children. By the time Frank, one of the youngest, was born the family had established their homestead in Salem. At the time of his death, obituaries appeared in The Detroit News and The Northville Record. Both papers referred to the crowds of people who showed up to honor the humble, unassuming veteran,

The above information on the Lewis family comes from Northwille The First Hundred Years, written almost 20 years ago by Jack Hoffman. The Northville Historical Society still has some copies of Hoffman's book available for sale. They also have two other publications on community history available. The books can be obtained from Book Stall on the Main, 101 Center, or the Northville Historical Society.

## **Board of education** votes for new NHS advanced courses

Wait and evaluate.

That's what Northville High School science and social studies teachers recommended to the board of education Feb. 6 regarding a proposal to add six additional Advanced Placement courses to the curriculum next year.

Teachers hoped that school officials would evaluate the effects AP classes have on staff and students before adding the courses.

The board voted 4-1, however, in favor of the additional classes with trustees emphasizing the need to provide students with more options so the high school could be more competitive with surrounding school districts.

"I firmly believe this will strengthen the entire curriculum across the board," said Principal Tom Johnson.

The board approved Johnson's recommendations to offer four new AP classes within the social studies department in U.S. and European history, economics and American government and two additional classes in the science department in chemistry and biology. Johnson estimated it would cost the district \$21,000 to implement the classes, including textbooks and teacher training.

The additional classes will bring the total number of AP offerings up to 15 next year. Johnson said the classes will be on the registration books for students. If an inadequate number of students register, the classes will not be offered. However, the option will remain open for subsequent semesters, Johnson added.

"If we don't get enough students, then we wouldn't run it," he said. "But it would be on the books and available to students in years to

Treasurer Joan Wadsworth said she feels the additional AP classes will be an asset to the school.

"There is no reason why our students should not benefit from AP courses," Wadsworth said. "It makes sense to provide our kids with the options they deserve."

Trustee Jean Hansen was the only member to vote against the proposal. She expressed fears about directing students into a set curriculum where the classes are mainly content oriented and may gear instruction toward test tak-

ing.
"Offering a wide range of AP courses is contrary to providing a broad-based education and the school district's mission," she said, adding that she did not feel comfortable passing a proposal that the teachers opposed. "If any change is to be effective it has got to be supported by the people who will carry it out.'

AP courses were introduced to the high school this year with at least one course being offered in each department. The classes place more rigorous expectations on students. If students pass a test in May of their senior year, they can receive college credit for base-level courses.

The test, a nationally standardized AP exam, costs students \$72 for each of the 16 subject areas. Students can take tests in as many areas they choose.

AP classes are not required in order to take the exam. Students' chances of faring well on the exams, however, can be increased if they take the advanced course in that particular subject area.

A number of faculty members attended the meeting to speak out against the additional classes, voicing concerns that the courses exhaust faculty resources and time on a limited number of students and could compromise the quality of the departments.

Social studies teacher Stephanie Walker said the existing AP courses affect student-to-teacher ratios and the additional courses could worsen the problem.

'If we have no additional staffing, it will push the regular classes well over the cap," she

Walker said the average class size in the science department's 42 regular course sections is approximately 26 students, while the two AP courses have a student-toteacher ratio of 13 to one. The average class size in the language department is roughly 26 students, while the AP French class has only 18 students, she told the

In the social studies department, the teacher-to-student ratio in regular classes is 29 to one. while the AP class has 18 students, she said.

Science department chairman Ron Meteyer said AP courses impose a financial strain on the departments - a strain that has to be made up by cutting teacher resource budgets.

"Time after time we were told they would come without extra costs but textbook costs have increased 100 percent," Meteyer said. "Folks, the ripple effect of those decisions we still have to deal with."

Board members stressed the need to move forward with the additional course offerings.

"AP courses are a very significant element for a high school student when applying for college," said Trustee Tom Gudritz. "We can't ignore that - as much as we might like to. It is a step we need to take in order to boost this high

## New facade put on plaza

officials frequently cited Northville Plaza for building code violations as its vacant space fell into disre-

So much for the Dark Ages. Since the Pontiac-based firm of Franklin Properties bought the mall last year, Northville Plaza has enjoyed its own little Renaissance.

Franklin has brought the whole facility up to 100 percent compliance with code requirements. It's resurfaced the asphalt parking lot and added landscaping. The old brick wall at the back of the mall will be replaced and a sidewalk in front of the plaza will be added

The biggest news, however, is that the company has found enough tenants to completely fill the mall's retail space. A big part of that, company representative Mike Parks said, was telling store owners about the new look Northville Plaza's soon going to

Years ago, customers could walk into the mall and shop at stores which had entrances inside the building. That's changed. Now all stores will front onto the mall's parking lot. In addition, the entire front of the plaza will be refaced.

All of the brick at the front of the mall is out, replaced by glass. Completing the look will be a new roof facade of greenish metal.

Longstanding stores like the A&P supermarket, Big Lots discount store, Perry Drugs, Martiniz-ing dry cleaners and the Piazza Dance studio will remain in the plaza. Among the new businesses

coming in are a bingo hall, an antique mall, a video store, a home improvement store and a family restaurant.

Northville Plaza will also get new business signs as well. The large pylon sign right to Seven Mile will remain, at least for the time being, because A&P required it in its

lease contract. Parks said he's trying to get A&P and Big Lots to replace their signs with ones that are similar to those the rest of the plaza businesses use, but was doubtful he could succeed. The new signs will be uniform in color aud lettering





## Woman describes horrific ordeal

at about 4 a.m. that day and that a nightmarish series of events soon began to unfold.

Wells let himself in with a set of keys she'd recently given him, the woman said, as she sat watching a movie in her living room. He went upstairs to her bedroom without speaking to her but later asked her to come to him in her bed-

"He was just being really affectionate," the woman said, stroking her hair while telling her she was beautiful and that he loved her.

That was unlike Wells, the woman said, a fact that made her think something was "peculiar."

"Something was just telling me that it wasn't right," she told police. He soon asked her to remove her

clothing, as he had removed his, and lie down. She did so and then Wells allegedly handcuffed the woman's hands behind her back.

When she complained of the tightness of the cuffs, Wells allegedly responded, "Oh, is that one too tight?" and then tightened them further.

He then began stomping on the woman's back with his feet as she cried, police allege. He soon began striking her in the face with her diary, the woman said, which Wells believed proved that she was being unfaithful to him.

"I said I didn't know what he was talking about and I was begging and saying 'please don't hurt me' and 'why are you doing this to me?" she said.

At that point, the woman continued. Wells began to hit her face. back and shoulders with his fists, doing so often as the morning

"He kept telling me he was going to kill me," the woman said

"I'm going to give you a trunk ride tonight," she quotes Wells as saying at one point. "I'm going to show you how much I really do love you."

At that point, the woman said, Wells tried to wrap her up in the comforter off of her own bed. He Intended to stuff her into the trunk of his car, the woman said, and then leave her there for a couple of days "to teach me a lesson." Her screams and cries had no

effect on him, she added. "I ain't done nothing yet." she

stop faking it."

When she warned him that she would tell the police what had happened, the woman added, Wells was also unconcerned.

"'I don't give a f---, b----, I'm calling my lawyer in the morning any motherf--- way,'" he is alleged to have told her.

Wells actually did do just that after township police contacted him on Thursday. He has been convicted in the past on drugs and weapons possessions charges.

The woman said that Wells made her read several passages from the diary, complaining that it was making him ill all the while.

"I'm going to show you just how sick I think this is," he told her at one point, the woman said.

He then vomited into the toilet in her bathroom, she continued, then grabbed her by the hair and shoved her head into it. He held her there while flushing the toilet three times, the woman said, forcing her to hold her breath when the water rose.

Then, the woman continued, Wells handcuffed her to her own bedframe, forcing her to squat by the side of the bed.

"He asked me what my punishment would be for being such a whore," the woman said.

Part of the "punishment" was to burn his nickname, "Tank," off of her body, police allege. The woman had the name tattooed near her vagina.
Wells found a pair of scissors.

she said, and began heating the ends with a lighter. As she begged him not to hurt her, the woman added. Wells "just kept hitting me and telling me to shut up."

"Please don't do that," the woman said she said to Wells You're gonna scar me for life He said 'So what? You f--- broke my heart, you b-

Well allegedly shoved a washcloth into the woman's mouth to keep her quiet and then began to press the hot metal blades against her vaginal area, including repeatedly burning her clitoris. He paid no attention to cries the woman sald, hitting her and spitting in her face when she tried to move

"He thought it was funny," she said - so much so that he allegedly began applying the blades to other

gators noted that the woman has a series of burn marks consistent with the scissors on her legs, stomach and torso.

"I wanted him to go so bad. I wanted him to leave me alone so I tried to bear down on that damn washcloth in my mouth so I wouldn't scream," the woman remembered. "He'd tell me if I scream he's gonna hold it there longer.

Wells promised to leave after removing the tattoo, the woman said, but didn't even after he stopped using the scissors. Instead, he allegedly called a friend's house to complain about the woman's supposed infidelity.

"I'm over here now kicking her a-," she quotes him as saying

During the next hours, she said, Wells also cut her hair with the scissors and poured hot wax on her from a burning candle, all the while continuing to hit her. As he did so, he accused her of doing him wrong.

"Why did I do this to him," she said Wells asked her. "He (said he) felt so violated. He (said he) couldn't believe how violated he

Wells also allegedly made the woman, who remained handcuffed to the bed, read entries from a book of motivational phrases. When she wouldn't read them loudly enough, she added, he would strike her. When she cried, he would strike her to get her to stop, she said.

After several hours, the woman asked to be released so she could use the bathroom. Wells then allegedly took the cloth from her mouth, forced her to urinate onto it and then stuffed it back into her

Finally, the woman said, Wells curled up on the floor in the comforter and went to sleep, gazing at her as he did so.

"He just kept looking at me like everything was just fine, it was a great day, the woman said.

Why did you do this to me? Why did you do this to us?" she also quotes him as asking her shortly after that

Wells soon moved to the bed she continued, where he warned

said Wells told her. "He told me to areas of her body. Medical investi- her not to move, as the noise her handcuffs made against the iron bedframe disturbed him.

"Don't let me hear them clanking again," she said he said. "Don't move. Get your a- kicking if you move.'

When she asked him to loosen the cuffs because she couldn't feel her fingers, Wells allegedly punched her and said "'say it again so I can slap the s--- out of

He then spent several moments alternately punching her and spitting in her face, the woman said.

After some hours, Wells let her out of the cuffs and into the bathroom, the woman said. In the mirror, she saw a "lopsided" face staring back at her.

The left side of my face, from my forehead all the way down it, was just so swollen I could hardly see out of my left eye," the woman said.

She found bruises on her face, ears, legs, arms and wrists, had a split lip and feared her nose was broken. As she left the bathroom, the woman said, Wells grabbed her and cuffed her to the bed again, appearing unconcerned as she

"What's the problem?,' he would come in and ask," she said, "like I was just a kid trying to get him to read me a story.

He made her lie on the bed with him as he slumbered, the woman

"I couldn't sleep. I was afraid to go to sleep and he just slept away like it was nothing," she said. "For hours, just for hours.

Despite all that had happened, the woman said, she was shocked at what happened as afternoon approached.

"He started rubbing my leg, like being affectionate," the woman said "I just looked at him in amazement, like 'you can't be seri-

Wells even demanded that she hold him the way she usually did, the woman said, threatening her when she didn't do it correctly.
"You're not doing it right," she

quotes him as saying, "and you know how the f- you better be "He thought it was funny. I wanted him to go so bad. I wanted him to leave me alone."

Alleged beating and torture victim

Wells then allegedly ordered the woman to change the numbers on her telephone and pager, warning her that "if you don't, you're getting an a-kicking."

Despite earlier statements that he wanted nothing more to do with the woman, Wells allegedly said he would not leave her home until she did what he wanted.

I had to go there and he made me lean up and he put his finger up to his cheek like, 'Give me a kiss,' and I had to give him a kiss on the cheek."

She then left her home, called a friend at work and told her what had taken place. She begged the friend not to tell her boss what had happened, the woman admitted, instead asking her friend to say she'd been in a car accident. The friend refused, insisting that the woman tell her boss what had happened. The woman did so and her boss took her to her (the boss's) home and then to the hos-

In their search of the woman's home, police found the comforter, washcloth, lighter, scissors, motivational book, hair, melted wax, blood sheets, the diary with blood on it and the handcuffs still attached to the bedframe.

On the bedroom wall, written in red lipstick with two hearts next to it, was the following inscription: "Forever Mine! Tank.





Given the system's importance, you can imagine what would happen if it didn't work properly. Officials would have to resort to other means of communicating. While they do work, alternative methods take time. A minute or two might not sound like much in most jobs, but any cop or firefighter can tell you that in their business it can mean the difference between life and death.

The current DPS radio is old - so old that the company that made it is out of business. Spare parts can't be found. The

## Tough call, but right way to go

It's a safe bet that by now you've read about what a Northville Township woman claims happened to her

last week. Her allegations are a horrific collection of graphic descriptions of physical abuse, psychological humiliation and outright torture. The woman maintains that her boyfriend of the past three years did these things to her because he believed she was seeing another

Her account isn't a fun story to read. Believe me, writing it was even less so, though I'll be honest enough to admit that a

part of me is proud of the job I did. This is the kind of story that causes mild schizophrenia in a reporter. I had a very human reaction as I read police reports describing the incident. I felt sad and shocked and furious by turns. At the same time, the journalist in me got the adrenalin pumping because I knew that people would read every word of the story,

re-read and remember. I knew that would happen because of the graphic nature of the woman's allegations. As human beings, we're morbidly fascinated by such things, wondering how one person supposedly could do something like this to another. That's especially true in this communi-

ty, where this kind of thing just isn't supposed to hap-Whether the story should have included all of the graphic descriptions that it did was the subject of an interesting philosophical go-around in our offices,

Snider and I spent about an hour Tuesday night debating it.

As I've said before, "journalistic ethics" isn't a contradiction in terms, at least for most reporters. It's one of those professions where the bottom line isn't always measured in dollars and cents but also in an abstract standard of how well we've served the public's interest.

The media is a business - you learn that very quickly once you're in it. The reality of the job is that people aren't going to buy our product if we don't make sure the information we deliver is interesting as well as

At the same time, however, a reporter has to weigh that fact against his or her duty to the public. Sensationalism in a story may sell more papers but can give people a skewed version of whatever really happened.

Mike, Lee and I were conferring about where to draw the line with this story. When does responsible reporting cross over into sensationalism? We questioned whether several of the more depraved incidents that the woman claimed took place should be left in the story or thrown overboard. In the end, the version I turned into them made the paper with hardly a sentence changed.

I believed then and still do now that this was the right thing to do. Reading the story without those elements would have given the public a very different image of the woman's allegations. Readers wouldn't fully have understood what supposedly took place right in their own backyards without it.

My job is to tell them them that. When I picked up the paper Thursday morning I was satisfied that I'd done it right.

## Can't spend our way to less crime

First, some facts.

Over the past 15 years, in good times and bad, under both Democratic



Phil Power and Republican administrations, Michigan's spending on prisons has increased faster by far than any other Item in the state budget.

Swollen to nearly \$1.3 billion in Gov. John Engler's fiscal 1996 budget proposal, the Department of Corrections has ballooned a whopping 790 percent from 1980, when it spent a mere \$150 million.

To house a prison population that leaped from 13,000 in the early 1980s to 40,000 today, the department has grown from 11 prisons to 39 and from 11 camps to 16. The number of state employees in Corrections has increased from 4.918 in 1979 to 16.134 today - more than 200 percent.

No wonder former state Sen. Jack Welborn, who chaired the Senate Corrections Committee and was the Legislature's leading expert on prison policy, warned in his December farewell speech: "We are still moving with alarming speed toward the day when every Michigan adult is either incarcerated or working for the Department of Corrections,"

On top of all this, Corrections Director Kenneth McGinnis wants to spend an extra \$200 million this year to build four new prisons and

Prisons are expensive to build and operate.

Welborn estimates that new prisons cost about \$50 million each to

build and about \$20 million a year to operate.

An analysis of Michigan's prisons and camps indicates an average annual cost per inmate of nearly \$18,000, but maximum security prisons cost nearly \$40,000 per year for each prisoner.

By contrast, it costs a Michigan family about \$10,000 a year for tuition, board and room, books and spending money to support a child at the University of Michigan. The state spends \$4,500 per pupil in state aid to schools.

Next, then, some questions.

Just what are we getting with our money? Not much.

The Senate Fiscal Agency, hardly a bunch of criminal-coddlers, concluded in a report released this February: "While all of these efforts (to build new prisons) have attempted to reduce the amount of crime in this state, data supporting the success these policies have had at reducing crime are somewhat inconclusive."

Sen. Welborn's farewell address put it more bluntly. Calling the idea that building new prisons alone will reduce crime "misguided," he added, Many legislators are still behaving as though longer sentences will lead to less crime ... We don't need longer sentences for non-violent offenders, we need more effective sentences and sentences that fit the crime."

Corrections policy in Michigan seems today to be more insane than criminal. We keep spending and spending and spending, willfully ignoring all the while that we're not getting much for our money.

There must be a better way to run a railroad. Next week: some suggestions.

Many infectious diseases that once aused serious illness and even death have been brought under control by the widespread use of immunizations, also known as vaccinations.

These shots work by stimulating the body's immune system to recognize and attack a bacterium or virus that causes a specific disease.

A key part of well-baby care

During a baby's first two years of life, he or she should be immunized against hepatitis B; diphtheria, pertussis and tetanus (DPT); and polio and hemophilus influenzae B (Hib). At about age 15 months, another shot should be given to protect against measles, mumps and rubella (MMR).

Some parents are reluctant to have their children immunized because they don't want the children to feel the minor pain, but the injections are given quickly and most children cry for just a minute or two

Other parents think immunizations are not necessary because they rarely hear of cases of pertussis (also known as whooping cough) or polio and are fooled into thinking these diseases are no longer a threat. Children who are not immunized remain at risk - and they'll suffer a lot more if they get the disease than they will from getting the shots.

## Township hires Bloomfield Hills firm

The trustees voted to give Vandeveer Garzia its 30-day termination notice at a Feb. 9 meeting. Representatives of O'Connor-DeGrazia were in Township Hall on Friday morning, already working on the transition.

There was no debate about the choice at the meeting. When the board fired Vandeveer Garzia in October on a 4-3 vote - the third firm to go during the board's twoplus years in office - the trustees decided to turn the hunt for a replacement over to a special search committee. The committee oversaw the entire process and recommended O'Connor-DeGrazia to the board as the best firm among more than two dozen appli-

"We wanted a firm that would provide the township with excellent service and be of top-notch quality," committee member Karen

Other members include township Trustees Barbara O'Brien and Gini Britton, and Clerk Sue Hillebrand.

The firm and the township are expected to agree to formal contract terms this week. A draft agreement gives both sides the right to end the relationship at any time upon written notification. The firm will be paid hourly on a sliding scale: \$125 for partners, \$90 for associates and \$85 for criminal prosecution work in 35th District

The township was looking for a flat-fee compensation arrangement. The firm has agreed to reevaluate the situation in six months and discuss a possible flat fee deal with the township then.

O'Connor-DeGrazia is a medium-sized law firm with less than a dozen lawyers. The township's principal attorney will be James Tamm, whom Grant said has extensive experience in land plan-

ning, zoning and land management issues. That was by far the top item on the committee's wish list, given the decades of growth that lie ahead for Northville Town-

Other factors the committee looked for were experience in general municipal law, criminal prosecutorial experience, a good reputation in the legal community and a firm that would remain even as elected members of the board of trustees come and go.

The board also approved the committee's request to exist indefinitely in order to regularly evaluate O'Connor-DeGrazia's performance. The great deal of business the township has given its law firms in recent years - and the high bills that came with it ~ is something the board wants to keep a close eye on.

To that end, the committee will monitor the new firm's monthly bill statements and sit down with labor-related legal issues.

demand for emergency services.

The enhanced 911 system is one of the most important equipment elements in responding to the emergency needs of the public," the report said. "Acquisition of a two (dispatcher)-position state of the art system is highly recommended.

Walled Lake residents downed two separate bond proposals on Feb. 4., rejecting \$116 million for technology, infrastructure repairs and three new academic buildings. Novi residents voted down a \$33 million bond proposal by a two-toone margin for a new middle school building and other building renovations on Dec. 13.

Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski said it is critical that the committees get a firm grasp on the voting community's disposition before moving ahead.

"It is very important for us to gauge the community's sentiment toward the schools and what they are willing to support," Rezmierski said. "We definitely can't march out there and go ahead if the community isn't going to support us."

Back in August, the board decided against the idea of going for an enhancement millage. At the time, members of the citizens' committee recommended the district not hold an election because a majority felt the chances of passage were slim.

Under Proposal A, local districts had three years to hold enhancement millage elections to provide up to three mills each time. Northville Public Schools have a window of two more years to hold a millage vote. After that, millage proposals will go to the intermediate school district and any approved funds will be distributed among all school districts in the county.

"We bypassed a year of opportunity," said Rezmierski of the board's decision last August.

One mill would generate approximately \$900,000 for the district, with a potential total of \$2.7 mil-

lion for the next two years. Enhancement millage funds could go toward such items as technology improvements or building the fund-equity pool - one area that Rezmierski is adamant about.

"If the state were to fall short in fiscal year '96-97, we would have to be able to make that up," he said. "We need to be in a position to protect the integrity of the school district."

A major area of concern for bond committee members is an everincreasing student population and the possibility that all the district's schools will reach capacity before the year 2000.

Recent studies from the committee indicate that the district's five elementary schools will reach capacity (2,148 students) by 1998. Committee members project that

capacity (1,200 students) by the 1998-99 school year and will nearly exceed 1,600 students by the 2002-03 school year. High school enrollment is estimated to reach capacity (1,435 students) by 1998-99 and grow to more that 2,000 students by 2008.

Committee members are leaving no stone unturned in analyzing how to deal with the impending problem.

Bolitho said the committee is considering several options for a bond issue, including: Adding onto the high school building; building a new middle school at property the district owns at either Eight Mile and Garfield roads or land near Six Mile and Beck roads and then using Cooke Middle School as an annex to the high school; building a new high school, using the existing high school as a middle

the two middle schools will reach school building, while keeping Meads Mill open and moving the Bryant special education program into Cooke middle school; or build-

ing an additional high school. Currently, Bolitho has a list of infrastructure repairs that includes roof replacements, sidewalk repairs and parking lot reno-

"If you look at the parking lots in the district, they are pathetic, just pathetic." Bolitho said.

Whatever their decisions, committee members stressed the importance of being realistic.

This group is not going to put its head out on the chopping block unless they are absolutely sure this is the best thing for the kids in the district," Bolitho said.



# DOGS BRUSHING

By CAROL WORKENS Staff Writer

There's some debate over whether you can teach an old dog new tricks, but one thing's for certain, you cannot teach a dog to brush its teeth

Dogs can do a lot of things fetch, catch, sit, roll over, come. You name it and someone, somewhere has tried to teach their dog to do it Nonetheless, man's best friend relies on its owners for dental check ups.

Tartar, plaque, gingivitis and periodontal disease are words drilled into everyone to educate them to the need for good dental health care

Humans and dogs share the same afflictions when it comes to dental disease. The same terminology used on man applies to man's best friend February is 1995 National Pet Dental Health Month

To find out what a doggie dental exam is like, we went to Meadowbrook Veterinary Clinic where Joseph P. Osbourne, DVM was scheduled to do a routine dental cleaning on Casey, an 11 year-old miniature Schnauzer

Casey underwent a blood work up before beginning to minimize the risk of anesthesia. The blood sample checks kidney and liver function. 'We have caught some problems in the past by doing the screening," said Osbourne, "With older patients we'll give them a lower dose of anesthesia. With anesthesia there's always a risk "

Casey was anesthetized and a tube was placed in her airway to keep it open. An ointment was used in Casey's eyes to keep them motst.

Smaller breeds, like Schnauzers. and dogs with a genetic predispo-sition for dental problems, will need to see their veterinarian more frequently targer breeds or dogs with good dental genes could be seen by a veterinarian every couple

"We see dental problems more in certain dogs, toy breeds especial ly," said Osbourne "Just like with people, there are a lot of variables." Variables are genetics, diet and breed


"In toy breeds, their mouths are so much smaller. They need to get the same 42 teeth in there and it crowds their mouths."

To remove the tartar, an ultrasonic scaler which has little vibra tors with water is used. The scaler helps to break the tartar down so that it falls right off the tooth "Tartar is like a little rock," said

Plaque is made up of bacteria and when left to harden, turns into tartar. Left to accumulate it turns brown and gives off toxins that lead to gum recession and destruction of the ligaments around the tooth. When this tartar is left on the tooth, infection gets up around the bone and behind the gum line. The tooth will have to be pulled because their is no

instrument that will reach up that far," said Osbourne. "Every bite is probably a little painful."

Bacteria will spread from the mouth to the rest of the body and cause infections in the organs such as the heart, kidneys and liver. "When you're taking care of a dog's mouth you are taking care of its overall health as well," said

Casey has had regular clean-

ings, according to Osbourne, but she needed 13 extractions due to her breed and age.

She will be sore initially, but will be better off in the long run," said Osbourne. "It's probably more of a relief for her to have the teeth extracted.'

Any loose teeth are pulled during the cleaning. If Osbourne has to exert any effort, he leaves the tooth in Only loose teeth are

Dental patients are usually sent home the same day. "We try to go with as light a dose as possible,' said Osbourne. Casey had her cleaning at 3 p.m. and was ready to go home after dinner. "Most dogs go right back to their regular diet," said Osbourne. "They don't need a special diet after a clean-

In severe cases, a dog is put on antibiotics because of the extractions and severity of the tartar, because it infects the whole mouth, according to Osbourne.

A dental cleaning can take 15 to 30 minutes. For a general dental cleaning you can expect to pay around \$40. Pre-surgery blood screening and extractions are

Since a dog can't brush its own teeth, products are on the market that enable the owners to assist in the dental care of their pet A special dog toothpaste which comes in chicken and beef flavor can be used a few times a week either by putting toothpaste on a finger wrapped in gauze or using a soft human toothbrush or a special brush designed for pets and rubbing against the teeth. Most dogs will put a fight up during a home tooth brushing, according to Osbourne.

"Human toothpaste is not good for dogs because the foaming action tends to upset a dog's stomach," he said.

There are also flushing solutions such as Nolvadent which owners can use at home. New rawhides are now available which contain a special enzyme to help prevent tar-

Some dogs have a cleaning every six months and they'll still have a problem," he said. "Other dogs can go every couple of years."

A new treatment which is applied at six months of age is a fluoride treatment. Treatments work the same as they do in children, by strengthening the enamel. but are given only once.

## Harrington bends regulations a bit

Maybe you can't beat city hall. but sometimes, according to James J. Harrington III, a lawyer and member of the Novi Zoning Board of Appeals, you can get a variance in regulation for business or residential property.

You make application to the board, describing what you want. Maybe it has to do with a set-back front, rear, or side - so that you can build a residence or add to one already in existence; or you want to use land for a use other than that for which it is zoned; or you want more than one sign in front of your business - or a larger one than is usually allowed.

Whatever the request, the Zoning Board of Appeals schedules it to be difficult, and each member comes to the meeting having visit-ed the site and ready to hear the arguments expressed by the owner or the developer.

The board also listens to complaints that the neighbors might have. The neighbors receive written notification of the appeal, and if they are interested enough to comment they attend or send their opinions in ahead of time.

"We try to come up with some-thing fair or reasonable," he said. And it isn't done in a quick, hurryit-through fashion. "The evenings are apt to be long," he said, "sometimes finishing at midnight."

About the board itself, he said, "It's an exciting board - very active and cohesive. We don't always agree, but we listen carefully."

How did Harrington get into this line of volunteering? He said he applied because he was concerned over the Sunoco drilling controversy several years ago when property owners were finding their backyards being dug up and oil wells







## **Plot twists** stir action in 'Just Cause'

A brutal murder is committed in the Florida Everglades. Eight years later, a principled Harvard law professor tries to save the convicted man on Death Row who swears he is innocent of that crime.

For the small-town detective who investigated the killing, however, there's no question that he caught the right man — and no last-minute intervention is going to keep that cold-blooded killer out of the electric chair.

The clock is ticking ... and a man's life is on the line.

From this tense scenario emerges the horrifying realization that nothing is what it seems. Someone is the lethal mastermind of a deadly game .. and all roads lead back to the site of that longago murder - where, this time, there are two intended victims.

That's the story outline for "Just Cause," a Warner Bros. release starring Sean Connery, Laurence Fishburne, Kate Capshaw, Blair Underwood and Ed Harris. The film is directed by Arne Glimcher.

The suspense thriller is based on the best selling novel of the same name by John Katzenbach.

Connery plans Paul Armstrong, a respected Harvard law professor who, throughout his distinguished career, has vigorously opposed the death penalty. When he receives a request from Bobby Earl Ferguson (Underwood), 'a convict sitting on Death Row in Florida, for help in a last-minute appeal, Armstrong agrees under urging from his wife to investigate the details of a grisly murder that occurred eight years

As he strives to reexamine the evidence, before Ferguson is executed, Armstrong becomes immersed in a small-town culture in which race, family ties, educaresidents profoundly affect the attorney's ability to uncover what really happened.

Even worse. Armstrong finds himself in constant conflict with Detective Tanny Brown (Fishburne), the arresting officer on the case, who is absolutely certain of the personable, charismatic Ferguson's guilt.

Time is slipping away, and stunning revelations undermine Armstrong's certainty. Before long, he learns he has become entangled in an intricate web of deceptions that threaten his beliefs, his family and

In 1991, producer Lee Rich optioned John Katzenbach's bestselling thriller in manuscript form. Katzenbach, a former crime reporter for the Miami Herald, had previously written three novels, including "In the Heat of the Summer," which was made into the movie, "The Mean Season."

Connery, who is the executive producer in addition to the lead actor, was drawn to "Just Cause" by the characters in Katzenbach's novel, particularly the lead role of Paul Armstrong.

"It's an explosive story," said Connery, whose previous work as a principled upholder of the law in "The Untouchables" earned him an Academy Award and Golden Globe in 1987 as Best Supporting Actor.

"I play Armstrong, a renowned Harvard law professor who is anti-capital punishment — his position being that it's a cruel and capricious system that doles out torture for torture," said Connery.
"However, the character soon

finds himself experiencing the reality that is found outside the ivory tower of Harvard. He discovers that he is capable of things

that he never thought possible."

For producer-director Arne Glimcher, "Just Cause" is a wonderful story with an extraordinary twist. As it develops and the characters begin to unfold, we realize that concrete perceptions dissolve into illusions. Each of the main characters is pushed to a point at which he discovers within himself resources he didn't know existed - an aspect of the story which I

find very exciting."
"Sean is a definitive character,"
continued Glimcher.

"His persona - that of enormous strength and power --makes Armstrong extremely compelling. In the course of the story, he goes from being an essentially passive man whose life is a ratio nal series of deliberations to a desperate person who realizes that his choices and actions will affect many lives — particularly those close to him."

Academy Award nominee Laurence Fishburne stars as police officer Tanny Brown, whose own passionate feelings about the murder case he had helped to investigate pervade his response to Arm-

"A lot of what happens in the story is totally unexpected in a way that is very attractive to an actor," said Fishburne.

"A young black man has been convicted of a heinous crime murdering a 10-year-old girl. Tanny Brown is convinced that Bobby Earl Ferguson is guilty and should pay for his crime." he continued.

"Therefore, Ferguson's lawyer -Armstrong, an 'outsider' from the world of academia who wants to see Bobby Earl freed, represents to Tanny all that is wrong with our country's system of justice



## Sutton claims gold at nationals



Be flexible and creative Many ingredients in your favorite recipes can be substituted with something else or omitted altogether.

Keep staple foods on hand so that you always have the ingredients for several low fat meals.

Buy skinless and boneless chicken breasts or fish filets flike salmon, whitefish, halibut, flounder and tilapia) Marinate and grill or broil few more than you need for dinner They're great for the next couple of days in salads or

Many fresh vegetables can be purchased already cleaned and cut for you. They may cost a little more but will definitely be worth it if you cannot, or will not take the time to do it yourself Remember - you need three servings of

vegetables a day for good health Frozen vegetables (without any sauces) are an excellent substitute for fresh

A salad spinner is a must for cleaning let tuce. Do a whole head at a time and store in sealed plastic bags. Remember to buy a variety of greens to make you salads more exciting and nutritious. You can even buy cleaned and chopped lettuce and spinach that's ready to

Purchase fresh, minced garlic (not packed in oil) and save time peeling and chopping.

Double a recipe and freeze in individual portions for future enjoyment.

Make time to eat breakfast.

Don't go more than six hours during the day without food.

Drink at least eight cups of fluids per day. Water is your best choice, but iced or hot tea, V-8, or calorie free sparkling water in a variety of flavors are all good choices. Limit fruit juices since they are high in sugar and calories.

Reduce rather than eliminate favorite "junk" foods. Moderation is the key to success and happiness.

Take time to enjoy the food that you're eating Eat slowly and really taste each bite. Do no other activity while eating. You'll probably eat

Plan to exercise at least three times a week for 30 minutes Choose an aerobic activity that you enjoy, such as walking, dancing or swimming. Exercise makes you feel great and has lots of health benefits.

Keep a daily food/activity record. Review your record at the end of the day and focus on the good, positive behaviors, not the negative.

## Exercise makes body healthy



one of my inquisitive patients asked. If the object of your exercise program is to increase my beart rate to a certain level and hold it there for 30 or 40 minutes. why can't I just sit in the steam room or sauna to raise my heart rate?

Wouldn't I get comparable benefits if my heart rate response was similarly elevated?"

I pondered his question.

His logic reflected a misconception many people have - that the increased heart rate, per se, causes the body to become physically fit. Not so, unfortunately. In this case, the heart rate response merely serves as a monitor.

A regular, sustained increase in one's heart rate is generally recognized as important to achieving cardiovascular fitness. But the real training stimulus is increased body metabolism

or oxygen consumption.

Think of it this way. Many real-life situations may evoke an abrupt increase in heart rate, yet our overall breathing and energy expenditure may remain essentially unchanged. The steam room and sauna are cases in point.

Or, if we become extremely anxious or upset, our heart rate may remain elevated for some time, yet we are not really getting the equivalent of an exercise session. If we were, then high-strung, nervous individuals would be among the most physically fit people in the

During a one-hour talk I gave before a rather large audience. I took my heart rate several times during the presentation: 108 to 144 beats per minute. Was I getting the equivalent of a low-intensity exercise sessions as I talked? Of course not.

Another example. Consider cardiac patients who are taking medications called beta-blockers. These drugs can markedly decrease the heart rate at rest and during exercise. As a result, some patients have resting heart rates in the 50s and exercise heart rates in the 80s or 90s Fortunately, many such individuals can

still achieve average improvements in fitness with regular aerobic exercise.

Additional evidence comes from a study of cardiac patients with implanted pacemakers that maintained a constant heart rate, regardless of their activity level. These patients showed substantial improvements in their exercise capacity following a physical conditioning program. During their exercise sessions, their heart rates never budged from the values at rest.

An increase in heart rate alone does not cause your body to become physically conditioned. Instead, it is the rise in total body oxygen consumption that causes the favorable adaptation and improvement. For that, you need an exercise program

The Mustangs actually trailed 8-6 before blowing by the Hawks. Tami Taylor served for points







in group activities





## PAINLESS STENCILING

#### Or how add color to your rooms without gallons of paint

If you're looking for a fresh, new look for almost any surface, try stenciling.

For those people who are not sure where to get stenciling equipment (or what to do with it once they have obtained it), two area business owners have a few tips for painless stenciling.

Wood, walls, and fabric — it's all easy to stencil," said Diance MacDonald, coowner of Niche and Corner in Milford. But

she warns that stencilers should wash fabric to get the sizing out before beginning their craft.

Stenciling is one of MacDonald's favorite ways to add color to rooms. She has completed extensive stencil art both at her place of business and at home. She said

stencils are available precut or they may be handmade on mylar plastic Niche and Corner sells some stenciling paint and supplies.

The easiest type of stencil is one that uses only one color, but MacDonald said. They're all very easy. One of the nice aspects of stenciling -

which, incidentally, is a very old technique - is that you can always paint over the stencils if you need a new look. Jim Cowie, owner of Anne's Crafts in Northville, has been selling steneils for 13

years. He has been told he has the largest stencil stock for any craft shop in Michigan (and probably beyond). He has regular customers

from all over the state and Ohio. There are literally thousands of stencil borders housed by this family business

Cowie's daughter, Adrienne Smith, manages the store. She said stenciling was very popular technique in the 1800s that allowed Americans to achieve the elegant looks they desired in a room without the excessive cost of wallpapering.

Cowie said stencilers won't have any trouble finding the perfect color at Anne's Crafts. We carry every color of stencil paint

made (by the two largest manufacturers)." Cowie said. Anne's Crafts maintains a large stock of

the paint at all times so that Cowie never runs out of it They have almost 400 colors. Cowie said. To the delight of customers in the store during an interview, Cowie proceeded to

give a spontaneous mini-workshop about stenciling basics. The example he used was a wall border stencil.

He stated that these basic

instructions hold true when using any stencil in the store.

Using a one-inch natural brush (which covers most situations), pick your choice of colors for the stencil. Only use one color per brush. Use only one color per stencil both stencils and brushes may be cleaned for use again).

Dip the brush in the paint, then rub it into some paper towel you have handy. You are "loading" the brush. Repeat loading as needed. This is called the dry brush technique.

Other supplies for stenciling include a brush scrubber, spray adhesives, liquid stencil cleaner, and a paint tray (but a paper plate will work in a pinch).

Testing the stencil first on paper, pound the brush lightly over the cutouts in the stencil pattern for a light color. Pound harder over the pattern for a darker

One of the reasons for testing the pattern first is to know how to apply the paint to get the color you want. The strips of paper should

be about three feet long. When satisfied with the look of the stencil paper, tape it to

the wall to see how it will look when finished and where in the house it would

Cowie explained that the nicest aspect of using the dry brush technique is that a stenciler may apply another stencil (called an overlay) directly over the first one because the paint goes on dry.

"If you use these techniques, you can do any stencil in the room right the first time," Cowie said. When stenciling on fabric, he suggested using natural fiber materials such as cotton or linen Man-made fibers do not absorb the sten-

Anne's Crafts carries an extensive stock of precut stencils

He recommended the use of plastic stencils, since paper ones wear out and metal stencils are primarily used for embossing and decoration

Cowie suggested that projects such as making gift cards and wrapping paper would be enjoyable and appropriate activities for beginning stencilers.

"Be creative and have fun," he said. The Anne's

#### Feed your houseplants after their winter nap

Q. I would like some advice on recipes for organic fertilizers for my houseplants. Since the commercial ones on the market are so dear, they leave a hole in my pocket. I thought you might have some suggestions, especially on the ratios mixing bone meal, blood meal, etc.

A. The most important advice I can give you is never. but never, feed your houseplants when they're dormant they aren't actively growing in winter, and any added nutrients will stay in the soil as a buildup of mineral salts.

Of course, when your houseplants wake up to longer and warmer days of spring and start putting on new leaves, a nice organic breakfast would be appreciat-

I prefer liquid fertilizers for houseplants because you can adjust the application when vou need to. For instance, if the weather turns unseasonally cold and cloudy, and the plant enters an unexpected holding period, or if you're having an infestation of mealybugs or scale, and you want to reduce the amount of

nitrogen going into plants. you can just use a weaker solution

And if you want more blooms, or if the weather is fabulous and your plants are growing vigorously, you can easily increase the strength.

How can you tell when indoor plants need special nutrients? Here's my troubleshooting guide: Lack of nitrogen shows up

as yellow lower leaves, a too light green color or stunted growth; while plants lacking phosphorous will have purple, red or very dark-green leaves, and their growth will be stunted; too little potassium and the edges and tips of leaves will turn brown and yellow, or plants will have weak stems.

A good organic recipe for plants that I use is this: Blood meal is about 15 percent nitrogen, bone meal is about 21 percent phosphorous and wood ashes are about 7 percent potassium. Put them together and you get a great organic fertilizer supplying nitrogen, phosphorous and potassium at a ratio

These ingredients mixed together give a ratio of 5-6-4. Never fertilize your plants in winter

months; they have gone dormant. Indoor plants need nutrients

 Stunted growth, yellow or light-green lower leaves show a lack of nitrogen. Purple, red or very dark-green leaves, as well as stunted growth,

show a lack of phosphorus. • If the edges and tips of leaves turn brown or yellow and stems are weak, this shows a lack of potassium.

## Birdbusters to the rescue!

9. Woodpeckers are destroying my house. More exactly, the cedar shingles. I can count upward of 25 holes, varying in size from a dime to a quarter. I'm fairly sure there are no bugs behind the shingling, and I did have an exterminator treat the house about three months ago to no effect.

I'm about to replace the damaged shingles and have the house painted. Before I take this drastic measure, do you have any

suggestions that would help? A. This is a difficult problem without an easy solution. Here are several solutions recommended by the National Audubon Society:

Shield the side of the house they are attacking with a large sheet of heavy plastic. The plastic prevents them from getting a foothold on the exterior. Keep in place two to three weeks. In time, they will get discouraged and migrate to another

Keep a garden hose handy and when you see them on or near the house, squirt them with water as a further discouragement. Rubber snakes or owl decoys are recommended to discourage birds, but their effectiveness is questionable.

Place this mixture over the stain and leave until dry.

that is offensive to birds. Another repellent device, Bird Scare-Eye, is an inexpensive balloon with streamers, silk-screened in vivid colors. This is used to frighten birds away without caus-

A. Runoff water from copper flashings and bronze fixtures frequently leave bluish-green or brown stains. For removal of this staining, the Portland Cement Association recommends the fol-

Prepare a dry mixture of one part ammonium chloride, four parts fine-powdered talc, calcium carbonate or clay. Add ammonium hydroxide (household ammonia) and stir to make a smooth poultice.

necessary and, finally, scrub well with clear water.

g. I dropped a hot pan on my imitation butcher block counter top. It left a scorch mark in a half-moon ring and a small black hole. I have tried cleansers and even wood filler for the hole. Nothing has worked to mask the

marred appearance. The counter is 5 feet over the dishwasher with a sink cutout. Is there a method of repair without replacing this counter?

A. I don't think you will find any repairs that will be satisfactory. Painting the counter is not recommended for plastic laminate (which is probably the material), as it will not adhere well enough to withstand the counter top wear.

Consider installing a new layer of plastic laminate over the top of the existing counter. This will not be a difficult project for a handyman with some carpentry skills.

Inspect the supply hoses leading to washing machines regularly. Be sure there are no cracks or bulges. Consider replacing them at five- to seven-year intervals. It's also a good idea to turn off the water supply after each use, especially when the machines will not be used for an extended period.

Check the copper supply lines leading to hot water heaters. Be sure the heater is properly strapped to the wall to resist earthquake shock. Install a pressure relief valve with a run-off line.

Use the new enzyme-based products periodically for maintaining clear drain lines and avoiding unsanitary backups.

Inspect the roof, gutter and downspouts annually. Look for obvious worn or missing tiles or shingles.

As for landscaping, look for and correct conditions that allow rain water to pool



## Nutting was man of many talents

ANTIQUES

Q. I recently purchased a Wallace Nutting picture, and when I showed it to a friend, she told me that Nutting also produced furniture. This was news to me. Is my friend right?

A. Your friend wins this one. Not only was Nutting a talented photographer, he also produced reproductions of Colonial furniture of exceptional quality. But wait, there's more. He was a minister, an antiquarian, an author and a lecturer.


At the peak of his picture market, his studio employed nearly 100 colorists who hand-colored the photographs. The business was so successful that it was grossing as much as \$1,000 a day shortly before World War I. Nutting wrote 19 books and contributed to a variety of publications. His "States Beautiful" series and "The Furniture Treasury" are just a few of his finest books.

In 1917 he began reproducing Colonial furniture. He carefully based his reproductions on authentic originals. His craftsmen were expected to adhere to the old, traditional methods of handcrafting. As a result, the reproductions were of the finest quality of any 20th century furniture maker. Most of his furniture was marked by paper labels, branded signatures or punched markings.

The photo shows a Wallace Nutting Three-Part Mahogany Hepplewhite Banquet Table, marked with an impressed Nutting brand. It sold for \$4,125 at an auction held by Michael Ivankovich in Doylestown, Pa., In November 1994,

A. Your vase was made by the Dux Porcelain Manufactory in Dux. Bohemia, now Duchcov, Czechoslovakia. The firm was founded by E. Eichler in 1860 and is still in operation. This mark was used

from 1900 to 1918.

"Eichel" means "acorn" in German, thus the use of the acorn as part of the mark. Your vase would probably be worth at least \$900 to \$950.

Q. My grandfather gave me a silver

teapot. It is marked with the words "International Silver Co. — 09C — 16 Oz. - 63." The teapot is 6 inches high. There is also a circular symbol on the inside of the lid. My grandfather told me when I learned the meaning of the marks he would give me the remaining pieces of the set. I hope you can help.

A. Your teapot was made by International Silver Co. in Meriden, Conn. The firm was established in 1898 and is still in business. The numbers are model numbers, and "16 oz." is how much liquid the teapot contains. The symbol inside the lid is probably a trademark. Your local library is a good source for additional information on sterling and silver plate.

Q. I would like some information on a marble that I recently sold to a collector for \$300. It is clear glass with a white number inside and is approximately the size of a walnut. Was I lucky getting my price?

A. You got lucky. Marbles have been uncovered in ancient ruins in Egypt, Greece and Rome. Glass marbles became quite popular with children in the 1800s. Handmade and machine-made are the two basic collecting categories. With a few exceptions, handmade marbles bring the highest prices. Size, condition and type decide the value.

Some marbles were produced in Europe while many were made in Ohio, Indiana and Pennsylvania. Clear glass marbles with sulphide animals or human figures or numbers inside are known as "sulphides." Those with color, numbers or human figures command the highest prices. "Antique Trader Books, 1995 Ântiques & Collectibles Price Guide" lists a sulphide marble with a figure "8" at

## Feed your houseplants after their winter nap; winter compost

of about 5-6-4.

To ensure that your plants get ample nitrogen, give them an occasional extra watering with some fish emulsion. If you shop around, a gallon is about \$10, diluted it should last for years! So apply it once every two weeks when plants are outside for their summer vacation, or make your application half as strong and use it twice as often

If your plants are nonflowering varieties and low-light types, fish emulsion is their dish.

Another great fertilizer is compost tea. To make such a tea, simply steep a cloth bag full of compost in a bucket of water for a couple of weeks until the water turns manageable size so I suggest 3-

And, finally, if this sounds all "too much," keep in mind, accord ing to the advice of many experts. overfertilization kills more plants than underfertilization!

Q. I live in the northern part of the United States where winter temperatures are usually below freezing. What can I do to keep my compost pile cooking so that it's ready to go next A. Even at a very low tempera-

ture, your compost pile will continue to decompose. Of course, it will just be doing so at a slower rate. It's best to keep the pile at a

square-foot pile. This size will provide ample bulk to generate heat. A larger pile will take longer to break down, and be harder to

I know turning or aerating your compost pile is more difficult during the freezing winter months. but anytime this can be accomplished, it will hasten the breakdown process.

Many Northerners insulate their piles by placing hay bales or a layer of leaves over the mound. The compost pile should be covered with a sheet of plastic or a canvas tarp to provide some protection from the elements, but always allow for proper air circula-

Q. Over the winter I traveled through some of our Southern states, such as Florida, Georgia and Louisiana, and fell in love with the bougainvillea vine that seemed to grow and thrive just about everywhere I looked.

As I live in a northern area, what could I plant outdoors that would come closest to this lovely tropical plant?

A. Unfortunately, because of vour circumstances, it's unlikely finding a vine as lush and beautiful (to grow properly in your area) as the bougainvillea. The truth of the matter is it's simply not hardy. Why not move to a Zone 10 climate and solve the problem?

Here are some hardy native vines that I think you'll enjoy and are easy to grow. Various clematis species like Jackmanni Montana or Lasurstern have large exotic-looking blue and

de Lyon, which has red flowers with showy yellow centers. A beautiful hardy native is the trumpet honeysuckle (Lonicera sempervirens). Both red- and yellow-flowering cultivars are avail-

purple flowers. Another good

choice is the clematis hybrid Ville

You may want to look into the numerous hardy and vigorous

 bright orange — and Joseph's Coat, aptly named for its multicolored yellow, orange and pink flow-

Last, but not least, Hydrangea anomala (subspecies petiolaris) is a hardy climbing vine with large, fragrant, showy-white flowers. I think there is no better clinging vine — it's gorgeous.

## The right pizza, at the right time, in the right place

Good old time pizza made a comeback in New Hudson a couple of months ago when Boomer's Pizza reopened under new owner-

Though new owners Bob Fritz and family have just begun advertising for the five to seven mile radius they expect to serve, the verdict has been good. Really good.

We're already getting calls after someone leaves here, says the Vietnam vet who works summers as a groundskeeper at a local golf course. They say it's the best they've had in years. Some say they never had better."

Clearly Fritz is pleased that his simple concept, developed over the past couple years, works. He uses quality products, which means spring water in the special sauce, and high quality cheeses. He also treats customers like neighbors.

There's no real secret. he adds. He knows that the real secret to a good business is often keeping it in the family, too. Kathy, Bob's wife, and their four children, even a sister- and brother-in-law are pitching in On Saturdays especially, most are cleaning and cutting, taking orders, planning advertising or boxing orders as jokes pass and dad tries to "maintain my area" around the ovens. Fritz fixes each ple with an eye to aesthetic presentation, arranging tomatoes on one like a caterer's platter and watching, turning and poking finished masterpieces for a just-right browning on the thick crusts, which he butters as they come out. He admits, the more busy they become, the less likely he can produce always-photogenic pizzas.

But as long as people continue to rave about them, he doesn't mind.

The Boomer's pizza is a rich blend of thick cheeses with an almost-sweet sauce featuring a light bite of seasoning inside the usual red sauce tang. Fritz loads on the ordered additions of peppers and pepperoni, sausage and mushrooms, saying that he wants people to know Boomer's is a quality product that, unlike so many other brands, doesn't scrimp.

The dream began around 1990, when Fritz took an off-season bartending job at the New Hudson Inn. The Dolly's Pizza operation had just moved out and Fritz began contemplating replacing it. He researched and learned about the business. But plans eventually fell through. Still he had the bug. so he started looking for locations.

During the past golf season. though he was occupied in the long hours of his summer job, the dream still hadn't faded when a regular and a friend - whose own plans with Boomer's just down the street had fallen through - suggested they make a deal.

Fritz began collecting advice from everyone he could: small business owners, pizza franchisers. lawyers, accountants, buyers.

. and to lobby with his wife, who became nervous about the enterprise. With two children in college, they had to be sure, but Fritz finally convinced her. "Well, the lawyer actually did," he says now. "It was the right idea for the right location at the right time.

Fritz and his family have used their early success to expand the menu to bread sticks, subs, some sandwich items and salads. Pizza by the slice is an inviting 99 cents



## Advice on financial record keeping

**Money Management** 

When it comes to financial record keeping, people generally fall into two categories, those who still have the first check they ever wrote and those who would be hard-pressed to locate last month's credit card statement.

If you fall into the latter category, the Michigan Association of Certified Public Accountants offers the following advice to help you identify and organize important

#### HOME AND POSSESSIONS

Records and receipts for improvements you've made to your home can be valuable tax-savings documents. The cost of improvements to enhance the value of your home, such as a new roof, kitchen renovation or landscaping, can be added to your home's purchase price to increase its cost basis. An increased basis reduces the capital gains taxes you may owe if you sell your home for profit.

It's also a good idea to keep canceled checks, receipts and photographs or a videotape of jewelry, furniture, collectibles or other major purchases. Should you have to file an insurance claim in the event of damage, loss or theft, you'll need these documents to substantiate their value.

#### SECURITIES RECORDS

Investors need to keep trade confirmation forms concerning all purchase and sales of securities and mutual funds. For tax purposes, you'll need to know what you

paid for an investment; what you sold it for; what dividends you received and which were reinvested; and any brokerage commission you paid. Trying to reconstruct

this information years later can be

time-consuming. Tax records

Generally, the IRS has three years from the due date of your return to challenge your tax return. If a return is filed after the original due date, the IRS has three years from the date it receives the return to question your return. However, if the IRS can show that you underreported income on your tax return by more than 25 percent, it then has six years to audit your return. For these reasons, the MACPA recommends you retain your tax returns and supporting documents for six years. Be aware that if you fail to file a tax return, or if you file a false or fraudulent return with the intent to evade taxes, the IRS can come after you at any time.

There are certain tax documents you should hold on to indefinitely. One is Form 8606, the form you are required to file when you make non-deductible contributions to your Individual retirement Account (IRA). You should keep copies of Form 8606 until all your IRA funds are withdrawn in order to verify what part of your withdrawal was funded with after-tax money.

#### **RECEIPTS AND STATEMENTS**

Keep receipts of purchases until you've compared them to your monthly credit card statements. If any errors show up, you may want to keep the statements a few months longer. If your credit card company offers a buyer-protection or extended warranty plan on items purchased with the credit card, keep your receipts and statements until the period of coverage

#### **CASH MACHINE RECEIPTS**

Keep all cash machine receipts until the transactions have been properly credited to or debited from your account. For canceled checks and bank statements, you can generally follow the six-year tax return rule, except for documents that record purchases such as stock or real estate, which you may need in the future to support your cost basis in the event you sell these items.

#### **INSURANCE POLICIES**

Make sure you have copies of all current life, auto, health and homeowners' insurance policies. It's a good idea to keep old policies for several years after the expiration date in case a delayed claim is

WHERE TO PUT IT ALL

The MACPA recommends important documents that are valuable or difficult to replace, like birth certificates, securities, passports and deeds, be stored in a fireproof family safe or in a safe deposit box. Also, you should keep copies of these same documents in a more accessible place. It's generally not a good idea to store your insurance policies and will in a safe deposit box because some states will seal a box upon the death of its owner.

As far as other financial records are concerned, the key is to set up a record keeping system that.
works for you and that you cap regularly maintain.

The answers to your state and federal tax questions are only a phone call away.


## Remember, jobless benefits are taxable

Tax season is here and Michigan workers who collected jobless benefits in 1994 are being reminded that unemployment benefits are taxable.

"By now, anyone who received unemployment benefits last year should have received a 'Statement for Recipients of Unemployment Compensation Payment," Robert Edwards, director of the Michigan Employment Security Commission (MESC), said. These

statements or 1099G forms were issued in January, and the Information they contain is needed by claimants when completing their 1994 income tax returns.



## Looking beautiful on the big day

Consult a stylist and/or makeup artist if your wedding budget allows, or spend some time researching the beauty basics if you decide to do it yourself. Either way — it shouldn't be a last-minute decision. Step up your beauty regimen, putting some extra time into hair and skin care, well before the fateful day.

#### **STUNNING STYLES**

Think about the overall image you wish to present at your wedding before you invest in your dress, headpiece and other accessories. Is it sophisticated, elegant, traditional, modern, classic or otherwise? Your hairstyle should fit into the image you choose.

When buying a headdress, you should know that certain kinds work well with certain hairstyles, and make others virtually impossible. Simple combs, clips or headbands you may be able to fashion quite easily yourself. A crown or Juliet cap requires a bit more effort to attach securely. Romantic upswept looks, or a classic chignon, will surely need a professional's touch to keep them in place for the duration. And curls are always a sought-after wedding-day commodity — lots of them, on top, down the side or even in back.

If you have short hair, don't feel like you must walk down the aisle with your everyday look. Short cuts can be curled for a charming effect. Or go sleek and sophisticated by adding shine with a gloss and attaching a smart pillbox.

Taking good care of your hair in advance of the wedding date will ensure its good looks regardless of the style you choose. Keep it in good shape with quality shampoo and conditioner, and get regular trims. Have your hair cut or colored at least six weeks in advance, so you have time to get used to it or change it if you absolutely hate it.

If you decide to have a hairdresser style your hair for the wedding, meet with him or her a month beforehand to discuss your options, try on some different looks and decide on the perfect one. Make sure it's someone you trust and feel comfortable with. You'll need to bring any hairpieces you plan to wear along with a picture of the dress. Again, your stylist's goal should be a cohesive, overall image. Don't let anyone talk you into the latest trend when your gown screams traditional or classic.

#### **MAKEUP MAGIC**

Even if you don't usually wear much makeup, you'll need a little more to keep up with the drama of the gown and flashing

lights of the cameras. That doesn't mean that a flattering look can't also be natural. Use makeup techniques to hide your flaws and highlight your own best features.

If you tend to slack off when it comes to skin care, you'll want to be more routine in the weeks leading up to the ceremony. Cleanse, moisturize and exfoliate your face and neck regularly to ward off breakouts — and don't forget any other parts of the body your dress reveals, like a low-cut front or back.

If you want to hire a makeup artist, the same advice applies as for a harstylist. Meet with him or her prior to the date for a consultation and practice session and don't settle for anything that makes you uncomfortable. You'll need a little more color than normal for your features to show up in the photos, but there's a fine line between photogenic and overdone. Experts suggest wearing a slightly darker lipstick in a familiar hue, or going a little more dramatic around the eyes. If you decide to design your own look, the following tips should help you along.

- Start with a concealer to wipe out dark areas under and around the eyes and hide any blemishes. Apply the foundation, blending it into the concealer. Set them both with a dusting of translucent powder.
- Tweeze brows until they are slightly rounded and apply an appropriate brow color with a stiff, angled brush.
- Apply a neutral, light-colored shadow to the eyelid and brow bone, then define it with a slightly darker shadow just above the crease. Line the top lid with matte eye pencil, just along the lash line, and soften with your finger.
- Lightly dust blush onto the outermost section of the cheekbones and blend. Apply lip color with a brush for precision, and add just a little gloss for shine.
- Finish with brown or black mascara in a waterproof formula so tears don't threaten your terrific look.
- For nails, a soft, natural look is still best. They should be attractive without stealing the stage. The French manicure is still the most popular choice for brides.

## Buffet is smart way to contain wedding costs

The date was set a long time ago, the wedding party selected and invitations are at the printer's. About now the mother of the bride is concentrating on the wedding recep-

A seated dinner, plus dancing, is the most expensive solution. The cost of the food isn't what runs up the bill, it's the serving staff.

Help is expensive these days and, on an occasion like this, you'll want really professional waiters.

So why not consider the buffet alternative? This sensible solution reduces costs since it holds service staff to a minimum. But a buffet dinner does not have to be predictable. You can give it a certain flair and style that set it apart from all the rest.

No matter what amount of space you are

working with, separate the meal by different service tables.

Too often one sees guests carrying a plate piled high with an assortment of hot and cold foods, salads and sometimes even

The dressing on the salad will ooze into the beef tenderloin, the smoked salmon slips under the green beans, while the seafood gratin intrudes on the corn fritters. They might as well be eating chop suey.

Instead of one long buffet table with everything on it, place the various courses on individual tables. Guests will then savor each course one at a time. And better still, they will get to taste the food.

The separate tables don't even have to be in the same room. Place the first-course table nearest the entrance and on it have the cold poached salmon, smoked trout, mushroom tartlets, wedges of cold herb omelet, spring rolls, prosciutto or any of the specialties that the caterer would like to offer.

If you can make it all finger food, so much the better. Then guests can either put the morsels on a small plate or select a tidbit now and then. You might even consider having waiters pass demitasse cups of a hot

In another section of a large room or another room altogether, set up the maincourse table. The placement of the tables will depend on the number of guests expected. The greater the number of celebrants, the more dispersed the tables should be.

Set up several bars so that people won't

have to crisscross the party area to get to the one lonely bar.

This is equally true if the reception is being held in a private home or hotel ballroom. Any party spirit can be killed by having to wait in line.

Only the first two tables will need any decorations. The wedding cake, of course, is all you need to grace the dessert table. In addition to the very ornamental wedding cake, have plates with chocolates, mints or any other sweetmeat that the bride and bridegroom especially enjoy.

## How grooms can make a fashion statement

The issue of what to wear to a wedding definitely separates the sexes. The gown often dominates the wedding dreams of brides-to-be while they're still wearing pigtails and braces, long before they've even met their betrothed.

The typical groom, on the other hand, more often than not, has last-minute night-mares about finding a tuxedo to rent and locating two matching socks in time to walk down the aisle.

The truth is that formal wear, by every definition of its name, has never had much variety of style to offer the groom. Thankfully for grooms who would like to stand out from the crowd (especially from the best man and others supporting him at the altar), designers are finally finding more ways to push the envelope of tuxedo cut and style to give the groom choices, even lightening up so much as to offer a line of formal wear adorned with the insignia of a groom's favorite football team.

It may seem a little extreme, but ardent football fans can now walk down the aisle in a Team NFL tuxedo by Lord West Formals. As Lord West Chairman Harvey Weinstein explains it, the fans who pack the stadiums and sit glued to the television watching their favorite teams demonstrate a loyalty that can be measured in excess of \$3 billion spent annually on NFL merchandise.

Weinstein says, "These fans marry, party, attend all sorts of social events ... and we determined that Team NFL-inspired formals, giving extra meaning to celebrations after dark, would be well received by millions of gridiron fans."

Brides needn't flinch at the idea. The Team NFL tuxes aren't fashioned in garish team colors — red and yellow for the Kansas City Chiefs or powder blue and orange for the Miami Dolphins, for example, with a favorite player's name and number stitched on the back. The only obvious connection to football uniforms is that the Team NFL formal wear line reflects — what else? — a broad-shouldered silhouette and all jacket linings are printed with a pattern of the official NFL shield.

Accessories such as black-satin vests, cummerbunds, ties and pocket squares do come emblazoned with the crest and helmet of each NFL team. But, Weinstein reports, for a degree of decorum during the ceremony, the vest may be worn reversed to a black-on-black jacquard pattern.

If sports team tuxedos are not your style, there are other subtle design differences that can highlight the groom's personal appearance and also complement the bride's wedding dress. Choice of jacket style, lapel and shirt collar cut, color, accessories and even shoes can all enhance the grooms desired overall look.

Martine Niddam-Aerts, fashion editor for Bride's & Your New Home magazine, reports that black is still the prevalent color for the groom, with this season offering slight variations of ash and charcoal gray, and the new "black watch plaid" with just a touch of color, such as deep greens and blues

— and perfect for less-formal weddings.

She says in addition to single-breasted and double-breasted jackets, the European-inspired three-button single-breasted jacket, worn with only the top two buttons buttoned, is the new look for the season.

The usual peak, notched and shawl lapels are still around. Niddam-Aerts reports that what's new is the rounded notched lapel, with the bottom of the notch slightly curved,

giving a less angular look than the traditional notched cut.

When it comes to shirt collar styles, hip grooms striving for an avant-garde look this season may want to consider wearing a banded collar, worn with a button cover instead of a bow tie, as opposed to the more traditional wing and lay-down collars.

For the final touch of what to wear on the feet, Niddam-Aerts says slip-ons, laceups, pleated and faille shoes are still in. But leave the velvet slippers for the bride to wear, because for the groom, velvet slippers are a goner, definitely on their way out this season.

For the bride's sake, sports fans should also keep NFL-logo high-tops and cleats for wear on the football field and never, ever at their own wedding, team tux or no team tux.

## Find reception site that fits your dreams

When Julie Davis and Craig Moxon marry in August, they'll hold their wedding reception at the historic Buell Mansion in Denver.

Davis and Moxon chose this 1912 Georgian Revival-style house "for its panoramic view of the Rocky Mountains and for its historic atmosphere," says the bride-to-be.

If you're looking for that special wedding reception site that truly reflects the personalities of the bride and groom, you have many choices beyond the typical hotel ball-room.

Whether it's a casual celebration outdoors or a formal yesteryear theme you seek, chances are good you can find the place of your dreams right in your own hometown.

Alexandra Troy of Culinary Architect Catering in New York specializes in organizing elegant and unusual wedding receptions in unique locations. She has choreographed them in a vineyard, on many different yachts, in an elegant Long Island Gold Coast waterfront mansion and in the intimate North Shore Yacht Club that overlooks Long Island Sound.

"We've also done receptions in loft spaces, which are big, empty spaces in Manhattan that lend themselves to a lot of creativity in decor," says Troy. "In fact, in any city's industrial area, if the couple doesn't feel queasy about being in that location, you can find some very interesting spaces. And lots of companies are very happy to rent them out for Saturday night events, when they aren't using them."

In one five-story loft space, Troy created a different scene from the classic, beloved movie "Casablanca" on each floor. But that loft space had no kitchen facilities and almost no running water.

"You have to be very careful when you develop a menu that it will fit the parameters of the location," she says, "including those kind of limitations. Another example is yacht catering — when the size of the galley is 10-by-10, it can be quite small for a meal for 200 people."

She never recommends, as a result of these considerations in unusual spaces, that any family try to cater their own reception.

"If you hire a competent caterer, they know exactly how much to serve for how many people, and they know how to prepare under demanding restrictions," she says.




He also recommends that you fully understand all extra costs that add up. including parking, for example.
