

## Township OK sought in plan to double bunk

When it comes to space for its prisoners, the state of Michigan's between a rock and a hard place. Northville Township could help furnish a solution provided that state officials make it worth the community's while.

That was the message the township board of trustees asked State Sen. Bob Geake, R-Northville, to take back to Gov. John Engler last week. Engler's answer should come before the end of the month.

The explosive increase in Michigan's prison population has stretched the resources of the Department of Corrections (DOC) to the limit. Geake said that state officials expect to run out of beds by April 3.

To solve the problem in the long term Engler has proposed a \$200 million prison building and expansion program. In the short term, however, the state is resorting to double bunking at prisons all over Michigan.

Most of the time, local communities have little say in the decision. That's not true in the case of the Western Wayne Correctional Facility, located on Five Mile near

State officials want to double bunk at the Western Wayne Correctional Facility on Five Mile near Beck. That would increase the number of inmates from about 500 to roughly 775.

Beck in Plymouth Township, just south of the Northville Township border.

State officials, Geake told the board at its Feb. 23 study session, want to double bunk at Western Wayne, which would increase the number of inmates from about 500 to roughly 775. Engler, he added, is willing to give something to get Northville's approval, which is legally necessary due to a 1991 deal between the state and the township.

That year the township agreed to

## OIS mishap forces evacuation

A fire yesterday morning at the Optical Imaging Systems (OIS) plant in Northville Township sparked fears of a hazardous chemical leak and led to the evacuation of nearly 200 people.

Emergency response officials say those fears appeared to be

unfounded, however, and described the evacuation as "a precautionary measure."

Another precaution decided on was to call in the Western Wayne County Hazardous Materials Response Unit (Haz-Mat) to check the building for chemical leaks.

The results of Haz-Mat's investigation, begun Wednesday after-

noon, were not available by press time. Neither were the results of Northville Township officials' investigation into the cause and costs of the fire.

The blaze started at about 10:45 a.m. at the OIS plant, located on Five Mile near Beck Road. Officials

## Grants will improve parks

Thanks to a number of state-funded grants, Northville residents are in store for some renovations and expansions to the community's public parks by the end of 1995.

Fish Hatchery Park on Seven

Mile, which was virtually shut down in 1992 when the park's five tennis courts were closed, will get a boost this summer.

The Parks and Recreation Department has received a \$100,000 grant from the Department of Natural Resources to resurface the courts, which had

deteriorated to the point where plants were growing between cracks in the asphalt.

"It should look great when we're done," Parks and Recreation Director Tracy Johnson said.

## Bennett to fill vacancy on board until annual school election in June

Calenders can sometimes be deceiving. At least in new school board member Barb Bennett's case it will be.

For Bennett, who was appointed by the Northville Board of Education to the vacant seat created by Secretary Pat Custer's resignation, the next four months may seem more like four years.

Bennett will serve on the board for the next four months to fill the vacancy left by Custer, who stepped down Feb. 13. The remainder of her term - one year - will appear as an item on the ballot during the district's June election. President Bob McMahon's and Vice President Richard Brown's terms will also be up for election in June.

As the district's newest trustee, Bennett, along with the board's six other members, has some long nights ahead to sweat out several key issues Northville faces, including whether to hold a bond or enhancement millage election, whether to continue with the revised high school Wednesday

and upcoming revisions to the new elementary report card - just to name a few.

"This is a critical time for the district," said Bennett, who has four sons attending Northville Public Schools. "We have some big

decisions to make."

In addition to Bennett's appointment, Trustee Jean Hansen was unanimously elected to take over as secretary for the remaining four months.

Custer, who cited "personal" reasons for leaving the board, was elected in June 1992. The board approved her resignation Jan. 23. The board had 20 days to appoint a new member once Custer left.

McMahon said board members chose Bennett because of her continued involvement in the district paired with the fact that although her bid to run for the board last year was unsuccessful, she received the most number of votes after Tom Gudritz and Martha Nield, the two candidates who won seats on the board.

The decision to appoint Bennett, was a careful one that board members mulled over before making a decision, McMahon said.

"Had the third candidate been someone who disappeared into the woodwork after June, the board would not have considered it,"

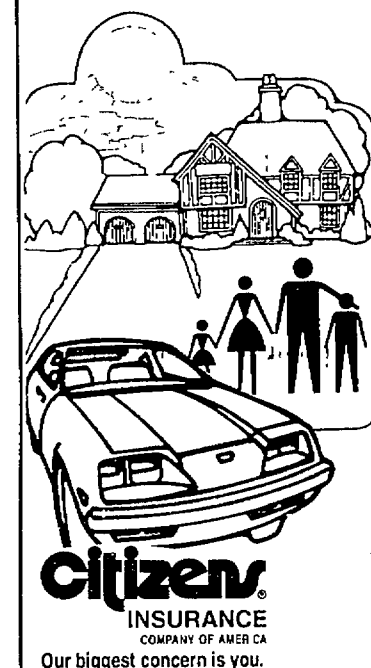

## Mill Race Matters

Over one hundred friends of Mill Race Village gathered last Thursday evening at Genitt's for an evening of dinner, auction and entertainment.

The crowd included a number of the Northville Historical Society's previous presidents. In attendance were: Bill Stockhausen, Francis Gazlay, Jim Harris, John Brugeman, Martha Nield, Arthur Rockall, and current president Carolyn Stuart.

Past presidents Carol Kíraly, Jack Hoffman, Ruth Starkweather, Jack Burkman, Ruth Chase, and Mrs. Cansfield are all now deceased.

In addition to these individuals other presidents of the organization during its 30 years of operation have been Betty Omar, Ray Riddell, Bob Daniel, and Steve Ball.

These individuals have left a lasting mark on the organization, Mill Race Village which that group administers, and the community. Gazlay has the distinction of being the only one of them to have been elected to non-consecutive terms. He currently acts as co-president and has served longer on the organization's board of directors than anyone else. He first served as president before the village existed and then was reelected in 1981.

Jim Harris has the distinction of having held office at the time the *Mill Race Quarterly* began publication 21 years ago. Bill Stockhausen and wife Carol Jean have run the group's successful Children's Christmas Workshop since it began almost 20 years ago.

Hoffman wrote this community's official history, *Northville ... The First Hundred Years*. Only a few copies remain of the book's third edition.

While Jack Burkman served the village came into being. Other early presidents not only administered the organization but undertook the strenuous job of restoring, researching, and decorating all of Mill Race Village's nine structures.

Kíraly's administration saw completion of the Blacksmith Shop while Rockall's saw work completed on the Cady Inn. Under Stuart the village has come to life with an increased emphasis on its gardens and natural landscaping. Stuart, herself a master gardener, has been instrumental in locating garden groups to assist in beautification.

During Nield's administration the society hit its largest membership and expanded into numerous new and exciting projects. Nield continues to oversee the Northville High School composite picture project for the organization. Have you noticed any of the signs of chemical abuse in your child that Charlie Stilec listed in *The Northville Record* on Jan. 26? If you have and you won't want to believe it - that's normal. It's frightening.

There's really only one sure way to tell. Take your child to a lab for a urine test for chemical substances. All you have to do is call your doctor and request an order to take with you. The test takes only minutes and your doctor will have the results in about a week.

If the results are positive, then you might start to wonder:

What if my child drives when he or she is high? What if there's an accident and he or she or any of their friends or other innocent people are harmed - or killed? You may not want to believe that can happen to your family, but we all know it can.

Did you see the segment on *Good Morning America*, Jan. 31, about adolescents using inhalants?

One mother told about her daughter celebrating her 16th

birthday, going out on her first date two days later and never coming home. The adolescent responsible for the auto accident had been inhaling a household cleaning product - a dust remover, and was high at the time.

Inhalants are being used in Northville, too, in case you weren't aware.

Stand up for what you value - the life of your child. To ignore it is taking the very big risk of living without him or her and living with the fact that you could have done something while they were here.

# New hearing date set for Ward proposal

If you're interested in the latest plan that Ward Church has for land it owns at the corner of Six Mile and Haggerty, circle Tuesday, March 28, on your calendar.

That's the date on which the

Northville Township Planning Commission will hold a public hearing at 7:30 p.m. at Township Hall, Six Mile between Haggerty and Winchester.

Ward and the township have spent the last eight years trying to

agree on a development plan for the 139-acre property. Ward is now located at Six Mile and Farmington in Livonia and wants to build a new, bigger church on its township site.

Church representatives have

received township approval for development proposals twice before but didn't move forward on them. Instead, the time limit on the approvals expired, moving everything back to square one.

Last year, Ward teamed up with

Farmington Hills developer Gary Sakwa to try again. They floated a new and ambitious plan with township officials: combine the church and a huge commercial shopping center into one plan under the township's Haggerty Planned Unit Development (HPUD) option.

The design has undergone major revisions in recent months but the

basic elements remain intact. They include the 240,000 square foot Ward Church (built in two phases), 300,000 square feet of shopping space and 4,800 parking spaces.

A loop road would circle the church and the shopping center, with an entrance off Haggerty and another one off Six Mile. Two more Haggerty entrances are also called for in the plan.

# Suspect in Player's B&E pleads guilty

One of the four men accused of breaking into the Player's Choice arcade in Northville Township was convicted last week after agreeing to a plea bargain that will see him testify against the other three.

Wayne County Circuit Court Judge Thomas Jackson found Bradley Michael Hatfield, 18, of Brighton, guilty of larceny over \$100 on Friday. Originally charged with three counts of attempted safe breaking, a felony carrying a maximum penalty of life imprisonment, Hatfield agreed to plead guilty to the lesser charge as part of a plea bargain.

Wayne County prosecutors agreed to drop the safe breaking charges and let Hatfield plead guilty to the larceny offense if he agreed to pay \$750 in restitution and testify at the hearings of the three other individuals charged with the break-in.

They include Joshua Prescott Cogo, 22, of Howell, and Scott David Buda, 18, and Aaron Raymond Morrison, 19, both of Northville. The three face three counts each of attempted safe breaking.

Player's Choice is located on Seven Mile in the Highland Lakes

Shopping Center. The arcade was broken into on Aug. 14 and about \$1,000 stolen.

In his Feb. 24 testimony to Jackson, Hatfield said that he and the three other men planned the crime at a friend's place in Brighton and then described how they carried it off later that night.

Jackson will sentence Hatfield on April 21. He remains free on bond but faces a breaking and entering charge in Howell.

The three other individuals also have breaking and entering charges pending against them in other area communities. Jackson decided to handle them all at once, setting a court date of March 24 for that purpose.

Besides the three safe breaking charges stemming from the Player's incident, Cogo faces a fourth charge of being a habitual fourth-time offender. Persons in Michigan with three felony criminal convictions can face the habitual offender charge if convicted of a fourth felony.

It carries a penalty of 15 years in prison if the prior convictions carried prison sentences of five years or less, life if they were for offenses with sentences of five years or more. Cogo faces the 15-

year charge.

Morrison also faces a fourth charge of being a habitual second-time offender in connection with the Player's incident. Persons in Michigan with a felony conviction can face the charge if convicted of a second felony. It carries a penalty of one and a half times the maximum sentence of the felony conviction — in this case, life.

All three have pled not guilty but remain behind bars after being unable to post high bonds. Cogo and Buda are serving time in the Oakland County Jail after being convicted of breaking and entering in Novi. Cogo also faces charges stemming from a Livingston County breaking and entering case.

Plymouth Township police have received warrants for both Cogo and Buda on a breaking and entering charge in their community last May. They have not yet charged the two with the crime but are expected to before the March 24 hearing.

Morrison remains in the Wayne County Jail. Last week he was bound over for trial on a breaking and entering case arising out of Northville City. That case is also expected to be dealt with on March 24.



## Benefit for cancer patient nets \$44,000

Every time Kathy Karney is asked about how the Northville and Novi communities have rallied to raise funds for her bone-marrow transplant, she gets a little overwhelmed.

"I don't know 445 people," said an incredulous Karney of the number of people who attended a fund-raising dinner at Northville High School for her last Friday.

Friends and family launched a fund-raising campaign for the Novi resident a little more than a month ago after Karney learned that her insurance companies would not cover the some \$160,000 it will cost for her self-donating bone-marrow transplant.

Karney, who is in the middle of a second cycle of chemotherapy treatment, will travel to Duke University in North Carolina in May to undergo the procedure. At that time, she will have to make a \$75,000 down payment to the university. The procedure is considered experimental for breast cancer patients by the family's insur-

ance companies, leaving Karney responsible for the hefty bill.

Friends, family and concerned community members, gathered at the high school cafeteria Friday for a silent auction and awaited the announcement of the winners of the 7,000 raffle tickets that had been sold. Thousands of dollars in prizes, including televisions, restaurant gift certificates and free hotel stays were donated to the cause.

Their determined effort managed to raise \$44,000 for Karney, who was unable to attend the event because she was too sick as a result of her chemotherapy treatments. In addition, employees of General Motors in Ypsilanti, where Kathy's husband Vic works, raised \$15,000 last month.

"I heard it was absolutely fantastic," Karney said. "I had relatives call and say it was a wonderful show of support. People have been so generous."

Lynda Baca, the fund-raiser organizer and Karney's neighbor, said she was very pleased with the effort.

"The people I talked with said they felt it was a nice event and well organized," Baca said. "We're very pleased. It exceeded all of our tentative expectations."

Although she is happy with last week's turnout, Baca, whose relentless attitude has been a driving force behind the effort, said her work is far from over.

Baca has organized a concert by "Down With Hatred," an alternative music group, at the Marquis Theater Saturday, March 11. Tickets will be \$5 with all proceeds going toward Karney's fund. Baca said she hopes to get a large turnout from the community's young people.

Future events to be scheduled include a Domino's Pizza night during the end of March. All profits from pizza sold during a specified time period will go to Karney's cause.

In addition, the owners of Player's Billiards, located at 10 Mile Road and Haggerty, are organizing a nine-ball tournament to be held in April.

All donations and money raised

are going through My Friends Care, a non-profit organization that assists cancer patients in need of bone-marrow transplants. If for some reason in the future Karney no longer needs the funds for her treatment, the money raised will go to someone else who needs it. All donations are tax deductible.

The snowballing efforts by concerned residents has been both overwhelming and gratifying, Baca said.

Karney, who has three children attending Northville Public Schools, began her treatment in January. The procedure includes three 21-day sessions of chemotherapy treatment in Novi. In May Karney will travel to Duke to undergo the marrow transplant, where she will stay for at least three weeks. The entire procedure will be completed by the beginning of June.

"We keep marking the days off," Karney said.

"My kids keep saying, 'just two more cycles. Mom. You're almost there.' They've been great."

## OCC to ask for 1 mill hike

Voters in the Oakland Community College district will decide the fate of a property tax request on Thursday, March 16. OCC is asking a general-purpose increase of one mill (\$1 per \$1,000 of state equalized valuation).

Here are answers to some readers' questions:

**Q. Do I vote in my school or city (township) precinct?**

A. Your school precinct. To be absolutely sure, contact your local school district.

**Q. Why a Thursday election? Most school elections are held Mondays and general elections Tuesdays.**

A. "We wanted it to take place so voters could concentrate on OCC exclusively. We wanted to be judged on our merits and the merits of the institution. We picked a day when others were unlikely to have elections. It could have been any day," said a college spokesman.

Thursday is an unusual day for voting. The Walled Lake School District had a strong turnout with a Saturday election. Lawmakers in Lansing are considering a plan to confine all voting to three days a year—one each in May, August and November.

**Q. I'm suffering from sticker shock. OCC is collecting 0.85 mill now and 0.82 next year. This will double the tax rate.**

A. It's complicated but understandable.

OCC has three sources of revenue:

1. State aid, which has slipped from 41 percent of the budget in 1974 to 24 percent currently. The governor's budget proposes a 2 percent increase for OCC, less than the rate of inflation. Oakland County, considered fabulously wealthy in the State Capitol, got rough treatment in the Proposal A school finance reform, and OCC gets less from the higher education budget.

2. Tuition and fees, which have grown from 21 percent to 38 percent in the same 20 years. OCC board members have constantly steamed at tuition rate hikes but agreed to them reluctantly. Now they want to hold the tuition line.

3. Property taxes. OCC's all-time high rate was about 1.7 mills in 1979. That consisted of one mill approved by the voters for operations and 0.7 mills approved by the board for debt service on building construction.

The one mill for operating has

been whittled down by the Headlee Amendment to 0.85 mill currently. The bond issues have been paid off, so there is no debt service millage.

Approval of the March 16 proposal would put the rate at about what it was in 1979.

Here's what's different in 1995:

- State law no longer permits the board to sell bonds and levy millage.

- OCC doesn't need new buildings. It needs technology, equipment and repair of buildings and infrastructure that are 25 to 30 years old—hence, a general purpose millage rather than a bond issue millage.

- Some capital improvements were paid for by the sale of excess land. "We can no longer afford to sell of any more of our patrimony," said the college spokesman.

**Q. If we approve the one mill, will the board levy the full amount every year?**

A. It will the first year, when building repairs will be the top priority, officials say.

In later years, the board may levy less. Historically, OCC trustees have been fiscally conservative and have balked at levying more than necessary, in this reporter's experience.

**Q. They're asking for a mill "in perpetuity." I've never heard of a millage request in perpetuity.**

A. It's standard among community colleges. OCC's first mill, now shrunk to 0.85, was voted in perpetuity. Northwestern Community College just passed a renewal millage in perpetuity.

Reasons: College finance doesn't gyrate the way K-12 finance does; and it's costly to go back to voters in such a large institution.

**Q. The ballot proposal says a mill will raise \$29.9 million. What will the new money be used for?**

A. "For the first two years, we'll put it entirely in maintenance and equipment since we're so far behind," said Chancellor Patsy Calkins. "We're about \$40 million behind—\$19 million for maintenance and \$21 million for equipment."

**Q. And after that?**

A. "We'll need \$11 million a year for maintenance out to about five years, then \$9 million thereafter," the chancellor said. "After that, it will be new programs."

## Victim continues her struggle to build new life in community

(Editor's note: This article is an update about a woman who was recently the victim of rape and is trying to start a new life in this community. To protect her identity she will be referred to by the pseudonym "Sarah.")

A little help can go a long way, as a new Northville Township resident can attest.

"Sarah" is a native of Peru and moved to Northville from California in January after becoming a victim of rape. She and her family arrived virtually penniless and had no place to stay.

It was during their search for an apartment that Sarah and her family met Eva Pieper, a leasing agent for Northridge Meadows apartments on Seven Mile. The chance meeting led Pieper to organize a relief effort to help the family get back on their feet.

Northville residents have donated more than \$520 to date, Pieper said, as well as an assortment of

clothes and other needed items. The family has been able to purchase a badly needed car as well.

Pieper said that her goal, however, remains to raise \$2,000 for Sarah and her family.

Donations of money, food and clothing are still being sought, as are leads on a job for Sarah's husband.

Pieper's set up a special account with NBD bank. It's a non-profit fund and donations to it are tax-deductible. You can make a donation by check at any NBD branch.

Two are located in Northville: one on Eight Mile near Haggerty and the other on Seven Mile in the Highland Lakes shopping center. Checks should be made out to "The Northridge Meadows Relief Fund."

There's another way to help: visiting Shear Impressions. Pieper's hair salon. It's located on Nine Mile in Farmington Hills. In a special offer, men can get their hair cut for \$10, women for \$20 and a package of four tanning booth visits goes for \$12. All of the money

goes directly to the relief fund account.

Those interested should pay by check and the checks should be made out to the fund. Call Shear Impressions for an appointment at (810) 476-8870.

The family needs clothing, particularly warm winter clothing, Pieper said. Sarah wears a size 10-12 and her mother wears size 14. Sarah's husband wears 34 inch-waist pants and "large" size shirts and coats. Their son is three years old.

Sarah's husband worked at a restaurant in California for the last five years and was forced to leave his job when the family moved. He also has completed a course in finish carpentry. He's looking for a job. If you have a lead on one, contact Pieper at 344-9770 from 10 a.m.-4 p.m. or at Shear Impressions after 4 p.m.

## Bill would limit school elections

School districts would be confined to three election dates a year under a plan being seriously considered in the Michigan Legislature.

"Election consolidation" is the idea of Rep. Bob Brackenridge, R-St. Joseph, chair of the House Local Government Committee. He is a former Berrien County clerk.

Brackenridge is considering setting election dates in May, August and November under state law. In even years, state elections would be held in August and November; in odd years, municipal elections in August and November.

School districts would hold their board elections in May. If they wanted to hold special millage or bond issue votes, they'd have to pick between August and Novem-

ber.

What prompted the idea was his experience with the Berrien Springs School District. In one year, officials held nine elections.

Initial reaction from school leaders was that it would tie their hands.

Under Brackenridge's plan, the only exceptions to the May-August-November dates would be those allowed in the Michigan Constitution: recalls and special elections called by the governor to fill legislative and congressional vacancies.

Brackenridge said the May date is not carved in granite. But he likes May better than the current second Monday in June because it would give new school board members time to learn the job before they had to pass a budget (fiscal

year starts July 1) and negotiate labor contracts.

With just three fixed election dates per year, he said, voter turnout would be increased. Brackenridge is waiting for reaction from the Michigan Association of School Boards (MASB).

Justin King, executive director of MASB, said that the group's representative assembly hadn't had a chance to discuss the proposal. His first question: "What evidence do we have that it would improve voter turnout? Are fewer elections worth the loss of flexibility?"

"It's curious," King went on. "That the same Legislature that wants to remove rules and regulations (by repealing the School Code) now wants to control the times we hold elections."

## Teacher strike law might toughen unions

Bargaining with teachers may be tougher - not easier - under the new state law that takes effect the first of April.

PA 112 of 1994 will prohibit and punish teacher strikes. It also will limit the issues the Michigan Education Association and Michigan Federation of Teachers may bargain over.

Board of education members got prepared at a recent workshop of the Michigan Association of School Boards (MASB).

The attorneys' advice in a nutshell: Don't let the union bargain with individual trustees, beware of informational picketing, be prepared in small towns for boycotts of merchants on the school board, don't fall for "marathon bargaining" and "news blackout" proposals, and don't be surprised if teachers pressure to get the kids on the union's side.

Susan Dumala, MASB counsel who has negotiated some 200 contracts, predicted there will be "fewer strikes but more pressure. There might be a few strikes to test the law. Many of you will operate without a contract. That can be painstakingly cruel - a strike

gets it over with.

Stage one will be "softening up" - an increase in the number of grievances, a request for early bargaining because of so many "serious issues."

Stage two will be the "near impasse" as issues are defined. "Frequently employed strategies include union news releases indicating the board's team is stalling, attacks on the integrity and competency of the board's negotiating team ... direct pleas to individual board members ... mass attendance at board meetings ..."

Stage three will be a strike threat, she said.

Dumala's strongest advice was that board members shouldn't fall for the union's "divide and conquer" tactic by bargaining individually. Tough school board members may face boycotts of their stores and cancellation of insurance policies with agents.

"Blast the boss" means the union will question every administrative decision such as fixing a roof. The board's chief negotiator will be pictured as "incompetent and inflexible." The negotiator will be accused of failing to relay the union position to the board.

Union proposals for marathon

bargaining were called "a trap" by the MASB lawyer. "You can settle in an hour. It makes you move because you want to get out of there. Don't get suckered. You make bad decisions when you're tired. Set up bargaining rules - for example, three hours," Dumala suggested.

She said the "work-to-rule" tactic means involving kids on the union's side. Union zealots won't volunteer for activities such as Halloween parties, National Honor Society and football.

MEA will use outsiders to set up a "Crisis Center" in a community and informational picketing. The "lamb to slaughter" tactic is using teachers who don't even know what the issues are to picket school offices.

When union members storm a board meeting, school trustees must "sit there and take it," she added. "Avoid being trapped into open public discussion of negotiations at a board meeting."

The union will propose a "news blackout." But its real purposes are to decrease the board's chance of community support and strengthen the union's hand in feeding information to its own members.

## DARE program expands

DARE isn't just for elementary students anymore.

In fact, Northville middle school students graduated just three weeks ago from the Drug Abuse Resistance Education (DARE) curriculum for the first time.

Seventh and eighth graders at the Our Lady of Victory (OLV) private school completed the 10-lesson DARE program on Friday, Feb. 10. It's the first occasion that middle school students in Northville have taken part in the nationwide police/school anti-drug and anti-violence education program.

The more well-known 17-week DARE program for elementary school students has been in Northville's private schools for two years now. The new middle school program is a compacted, 10-part affair that reinforces the lessons taught to younger grades.

"It's a lesson plan that's more mature for an older group of students," Northville Township Police Officer Matt Mayes said.

Mayes and Northville City Officer Jim Marks are DARE-certified instructors who work with area educators to conduct the program. DARE works at teaching youngsters about the dangers of drugs and helps them avoid using them.

The program supplies suggestions of how young people can maintain good self-esteem, the best defense against drug use. The idea is to help students turn away from drugs in the first place instead of reacting to a problem after it comes into being.

The middle school program also includes discussion of anti-violence strategies. It focuses on helping students manage their feelings when they get angry.

"It went real well," Mayes said of the OLV classes. "They were very receptive to the lessons."

# Fire at OIS plant results in the use of Haz-Mat team

at the scene said the blaze appeared to be out by 11:30 a.m. They weren't certain, however, because firefighters couldn't enter the building until Haz-Mat personnel had checked it for chemical releases.

OIS opened the plant last November. It will be used to design and build flat-panel computer screens for a variety of functions including military aircraft. The company does keep some extremely hazardous chemicals on-site, OIS President Rex Tapp said, but employs a variety of safety measures to ensure they won't be released in a fire.

Tapp described the blaze as "a small fire" that was quickly brought under control.

Township officials decided to call out Haz-Mat to make sure. The organization is a 22-community cooperative that pools money and personnel to respond to emergencies involving any kind of hazardous materials.

Phil Wagner heads up Haz-Mat and said that preliminary indications were that no chemicals were

released in the fire.

Wagner added that the blaze might have begun when fiberglass insulation surrounding a device designed to "scrub" chemicals out of the plant's exhaust caught fire. Township Fire Chief Bill Zhmendak said that some hydrogen gas might have been involved as well.

It was the uncertainty of what had caused the fire and the possibility that some chemicals had been released that led officials to seal off Five Mile for several hours.

They also evacuated the 150 employees of OIS and about 25 nearby residents and told the occupants of 13 businesses in the area to stay inside until the Haz-Mat investigation was complete.

"It's a precaution," Zhmendak said at the scene, "I'm not taking any chances here."

There were no injuries reported in the incident. At least one evacuee complained of nausea, however, and received assistance from medical personnel.

Officials from more than a dozen area communities assisted Northville Township emergency response personnel with the fire.

Haz-Mat personnel were on the scene by noon. A check of the area immediately outside the plant indicated no dangerous chemicals present, Wagner said. That prompted

him to send in two two-man Haz-Mat teams at 2:30 p.m. to check the interior of the building. Two chemists were also on hand to help officials evaluate the situation.

The evacuated residents were expected to be allowed to return to their homes by nightfall. When OIS will reopen, however, remains an open question

# Church B&E suspect charged

A 19-year-old Northville man faces up to 10 years in prison for the October break-in at the First Presbyterian Church on Main Street that resulted in more than \$400 in stereo and television equipment being stolen.

Aaron Raymond Morrison, a 19-year-old Northville resident, pleaded not guilty to one count of breaking and entering and one count of being an habitual criminal in 35th District Court in Plymouth Feb. 17.

The church suffered two serious break-ins over the course of one month, with two stereo speakers, a television, VCR and a compact disc player being stolen Oct. 24. Several of the church's offices were also ransacked. All the stolen items besides the CD player were later recovered.

About three weeks later on Nov. 16, the church suffered a second break-in with a computer, keyboard and monitor valued at roughly \$1,720 being taken. Northville City Police charged Morrison in the first burglary.

The presiding judge granted Northville Police Sergeant Dave Fendele's request to require a \$500,000 cash bond based upon Morrison's criminal history as both a juvenile and an adult. Morrison

faces up to 10 years in prison for the B&E charge and one-and-a-half times the maximum sentence for being an habitual offender.

Currently Morrison faces three counts of safe burglary with three other teen-age suspects for the Aug. 14 break-in of the Player's Choice arcade in the Highland Lakes Shopping Center in Northville Township. More than \$400 in cash was stolen from the arcade and more than \$5,000 in damages were incurred in the summer break-in.

Morrison faces life in prison for the safe burglary charges and an additional habitual offender charge.

Morrison has been housed in the Wayne County Jail since his arrest by Northville Township Police in late November. He was unable to post bond.

A preliminary examination has been set for Feb. 24 at 35th District Court.

Back in December, a 15-year-old Northville boy confessed to city police that he was involved in both the Oct. 24 and Nov. 16 church break-ins, in addition to several cases of stolen beer bottles from Genitti's Hole-in-the-Wall restaurant around that same time.

The boy's case was referred to Wayne County Juvenile Court and is ongoing.

# Water tank demolition delayed by protest

The old water tank on Beck Road won't be coming down for a while - if it comes down at all.

In January the Northville Township Board of Trustees voted to approve using \$27,000 in allocated federal funds to tear down the tank, located on Beck between Five and Six Mile. Since then, however, a community resident has filed a protest against that move.

The funds involved are from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and are given to the township in the form of community development block grant (CDBG) money.

HUD and Wayne County must both approve the tank's demolition. Township officials expected that to be a formality, soon followed by the tank tear-down. Northville resident Jack McNeely, however, recently filed a protest

against the tank's demolition.

The tank is a noticeable Beck Road landmark. A legacy of the Detroit Water & Sewer department, it used to be used for water storage but has been empty for some time. Township officials say it can't be used for water storage any longer and other possible uses, such as for equipment or records storage, would require expensive modifications.

That was one problem. Another the township faced was a lack of projects which qualified for CDBG money.

Local communities all over America use CDBG funds for a variety of community improvement projects such as loans to low-income people to fix up their homes. The problem in the township is that officials cannot find enough projects to use all of the available funds.

Some of the cash has been on hold for years and county and fed-

eral officials have told the township to use it or lose it. That led Treasurer Rick Engelland and Olsecki to develop a list of alternative projects that federal rules would allow the money to be used for. The water tank demolition topped their list.

The board in November approved the proposed "reprogramming" of \$51,000 in CDBG monies for the project. Township officials, however, got a bid from Richter's Contracting of Clinton Township to do the job for \$27,000. The unused \$24,000 was expected to be put back into the CDBG pot.

Soon after the board approved Richter's bid in January, McNeely, the township's former contracted engineer, filed the protest. Township Director of Public Utilities Bill Anderson said that McNeely is arguing that the tank can still be used for water storage in the future, a position he's held since

the 1980s.

"His contention is that it can put back into service," Anderson said.

The township disagreed, Anderson continued, writing a formal rebuttal of McNeely's claim. Soon after that, he added, he rebutted the rebuttal.

The board at its Feb. 23 study session rejected Anderson's recommendation to abandon the effort to get CDBG money for the tank demolition and instead use his department's funds. The trustees asked the director to continue to try and get the county's and HUD's approval of the grant.

That will mean that both agencies will require more review of the issue, Anderson said, possibly including an engineering study by a third party that's acceptable to everyone involved. To date, no timeline for completion of the investigation has been set.

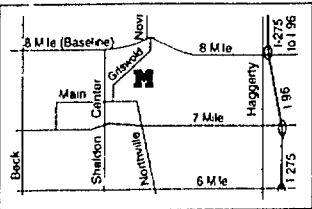

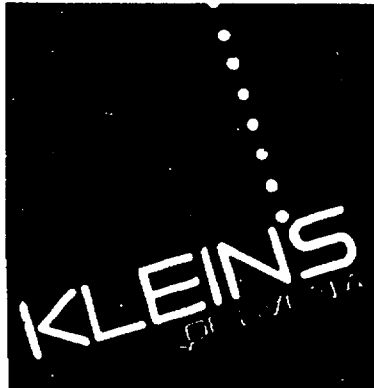

# Northville physician tends to Nicaraguans

Spending a week in an impoverished Central American country may not represent the ideal vacation for most people but for Northville dermatologist Dr. Louis Chiara it is.

Chiara, who practices out of Providence Medical Center in downtown Northville, traveled to Nicaragua for nine days in January to help treat scores of people in need of medical care.

For Chiara, the trip was the realization of a longtime dream to travel to less-fortunate countries to help people who live in homes with dirt floors in villages with no electricity or running water.

"It was so much fun," Chiara

said. "Every American who goes down there, I think, gets completely involved because it is so much fun."

Chiara's compassion and desire to help others might have come from his mother, a registered nurse who traveled to Algeria to treat victims of terrorism in the 1960s for the American Red Cross.

Chiara traveled to the Nicaraguan village of Chacraseca where three American missionary nuns live, the youngest of whom is 70 years old.

During his nine-day stay, he treated more than 225 patients for such ailments as vitamin deficiencies and dysentery and visited several hospitals and clinics, most of which had no electricity.

"There was one doctor who had to see his patients by the window because his only light was burned out," he said. "I gave him a flashlight I brought with me and he was so grateful."

"Anything you have here you take for granted. Any little piece of junk you give to these people and they love it."

Chiara gave away T-shirts, a watch and even some stale Christmas cookies.

Despite their destitute circumstances, the Nicaraguan people display a positive, upbeat attitude, he said.

"The people were so kind," he said. "And they take advantage of every positive opportunity they get."

Chiara arranged to have four solar-powered lights installed in the village's medical clinic and hopes to return to the area to continue helping the residents.

"The people down there did more for me than I did for them," he said.

## Altercation leads to angry accusation

Northville City Police and an emergency rescue crew were dispatched to Joseph's Coney Island on Main Street Feb. 23 after a man saying his face had been beaten with a baseball bat asked for an ambulance.

Police arrived at the scene and found the 38-year-old Livonia man sitting in a booth in the restaurant. He had a number of lacerations on his face and was bleeding profusely.

The man, who smelled heavily of alcohol and appeared to be intoxicated, told police that a resident of the Inn on Main Street — located above Joseph's Coney Island — had struck him four times with a bat inside the boarding house after an argument.

As police questioned him about the incident, the man repeatedly fell asleep and had to be awakened by officers to continue the questioning. The injured man was a former resident of the Inn but had been evicted earlier in the year.

Police went up to the Inn and found the man who had been accused of the beating. They searched the area and found no evidence of blood or a struggle, nor did they find a baseball bat in the area.

The man admitted to police that he had punched the other man once in the jaw, but said he had not injured him with the severity the officers described.

The man told police he encountered

the other man on Main Street, some insults were exchanged and the man who had been injured followed him back to the building. In the past, the injured man had threatened to kill the Northville man, he told police.

The man continued to follow the other man into the alley next to the Inn, the argument continued and then ended when he punched him once in the jaw, he told police.

He then left the scene and went up to his room. The man showed police his hands, which had no blood on them and appeared not to have been washed in some time, the report stated.

Based on a pool of blood in the alley, the Inn resident's story and the injuries on the man's face, police concluded that the man had probably been punched once and then had fallen to the pavement, thus injuring his face. No charges have been filed against the Northville man.

The Livonia man had been arrested the day before at Providence Medical Center on Center Street. Staff at the medical center called police when he refused to leave the waiting room.

When police arrived, the man was asleep in a chair and smelled of alcohol and appeared to be intoxicated. When the officer told the man he had to leave, he smiled, stood up, clenched his hands into fists and took on a "fighting stance," the report stated.

The man was arrested and released.

## Engler budget tight-fisted with grants for the arts

Getting state arts grants will become more competitive under Gov. John Engler's new budget, but the state will teach local groups how to write better applications.

Engler's budget for the fiscal year beginning Oct. 1 no longer will contain line-item guarantees for major institutions like the Detroit Institute of Arts and Detroit Symphony Orchestra.

They'll have to apply, just like suburban orchestras and arts groups, to the Michigan Council for Arts and Cultural Affairs.

And they can expect to be audited.

"We have asked the Department of Commerce to periodically conduct audits of our grants to make sure council guidelines are met," said Betty Boone, executive director of the arts agency in Lansing. "We believe it's important to ensure the citizens of Michigan

that their investment in the arts and culture contributes to the state's future well-being."

Deadline for applications is May 1.

## Deadly virus stirs action in 'Outbreak'

The inhabitants of Cedar Creek, California, are getting sick. Quickly.

A lethal virus, for years safely contained within the depths of the African rain forest, has found its way to this small community and is infecting the population.

The virus might be anywhere. It is more deadly than the Black Plague and more contagious than the common cold.

And it threatens to spread uncontrollably outward. To neighboring San Francisco. Throughout California. Across the United States. And, soon after, around the world.

Dr. Sam Daniels (Dustin Hoffman) is in a race against time to find the key that can stop the virus before it radiates beyond the small town and wipes out hundreds of thousands. He must also outpace his government superiors, who are poised to unleash a plan that will contain the virus in a manner as uncompromisingly lethal as the outbreak itself.

"Outbreak" is a suspenseful medical thriller starring two-time Academy Award-winner Dustin Hoffman, Rene Russo and Morgan Freeman. The film charts the terrifying course of a deadly virus, which is carried by a monkey host to a small California town.

and news reports have been assaulting the public with stories about emerging viruses such as Hanta and the mysterious flesh-eating strain; aggressive new forms of tuberculosis, hepatitis and other communicable microbes; and the continuing worldwide devastation of AIDS.

Non-fiction readers have been receiving a crash-course education on the viral crisis-in-waiting from books like Laurie Garrett's "The Coming Plague" and Richard Preston's "The Hot Zone," which have been sitting atop the best seller lists for months.

Set amid the context of these real-world reminders, the making of "Outbreak" is particularly timely.

"We are living in a time when viruses we never even knew existed a few years ago are now familiar by name if not experience," said Arnold Kopelson, who produced "Outbreak."

"As we disrupt the delicate ecologies of the rain forests and release viruses that have previously been contained into the larger environment, we run the very real risk of exposing our world to even more catastrophic epidemics. While fiction, 'Outbreak' is based in scientific possibility. In fact, the most frightening aspect of this story is the real potential of such a contagion developing in the world

at any given moment."

Director Wolfgang Petersen, who has taken audiences into special-effects settings before, such as the pressure-cooker atmosphere of a submarine in "Das Boot" and the life-endangering responsibilities of Secret Service in "In the Line of Fire," was excited to take the public into the mysterious arena of virological science in which "Outbreak" takes place.

"This world of viruses and these sophisticated laboratories is a totally unknown one for an audience," said Petersen. "To give them a chance to enter this world with all the horror and fear it can bring is particularly intriguing. Nearly every scene offers something an audience hasn't seen before. If a thriller takes place in an unknown world that actually exists, the results can be fascinating."

Petersen said that his goal in directing "Outbreak" was more than just thrilling audiences with the story. "First and foremost, I hope the film works as a great

piece of entertainment," he said.

"But beyond that, I hope it will inspire a lot of discussions afterwards. Since it is based in reality, I hope it's something that people can't get rid of after two hours in a theater. It should haunt you. It should sit with you for quite a while, because it touches a nerve. I'd like for people to think, 'maybe we shouldn't be fooling with nature too much.'"

Beyond its cautionary themes, however, Petersen hopes the film will elicit the same visceral response in audiences as classic thrillers of the past.

"I hope that 'Outbreak' is like the 'Jaws' of the '90s," he said.

"Both films deal with very realistic scenarios, but 'Outbreak' is perhaps even more frightening. With a shark, you simply have to take yourself out of the water to escape the danger. With an airborne virus, it can be anywhere. Wherever you go, you can't escape it. You can't see it, but it could be attacking you all the same."

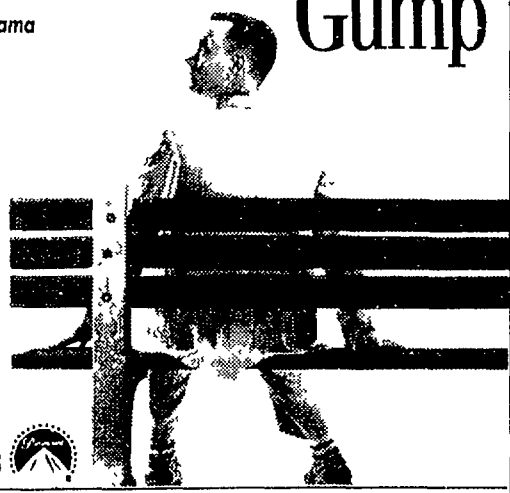

# Township board completes work on expenditures budget

The Northville Township Board of Trustees squared away the community's 1995 capital expenditures budget last week.

The board approved the township's current \$4.4 million budget in October. At the time the trustees were pressed for time and didn't have a full discussion of all capital expenditures in the budget.

They took up the matter at their Feb. 23 study session, approving a number of projects but rejecting many of those that the township's administrative department heads asked for. The trustees cited tough fiscal times as the reasons.

The Department of Public Safety (DPS) will see several capital improvements, this year. The biggest is expected to come when the board votes to buy a new radio communications system. The radio coordinates the activities of police, fire and emergency medical personnel. Replacing the current unit is expected to cost between \$250,000 and \$300,000.

Trustees said they'll cross that expensive bridge when a special committee presents them with bids for the new radio, expected to happen next week. The radio's large pricetag led the board to delete several other DPS capital requests, however.

The trustees did approve several other items including \$5,000 for fire department reorganization.

DPS Director Chip Snider praised Fire Chief Bill Zhmendak for the work he's done since assuming command of the department nine months ago.

"The only thing that's glaring at us is the lack of mid-level managers," Snider added. "Bill is really behind the eight ball."

The department, he explained, needs to fill the gap in the chain of command between Zhmendak and firefighters. Snider proposed making one of the department's three full-time firefighters a lieutenant who would serve as the chief's sec-

ond in command. Three sergeants will be selected from among the two dozen part-time on-call firefighters as well.

The three full-timers will undergo a written and oral screening process, Snider said, in order to select one to become Zhmendak's deputy. The three sergeants will act as shift commanders and would be in charge during critical incidents until Zhmendak or the lieutenant would arrive on the scene. The \$5,000 will pay for salary increases, the testing process and new uniforms.

DPS also received approval for two new police patrol vehicles (total cost: \$28,000), two mobile data terminals for the units (\$10,400) and a police radar unit (\$1,800). Federal law allows local police departments to buy equipment with money seized from drug-related investigations and prosecutions. DPS will use some of its forfeiture funds this year to purchase an administrative computer, a booking camera, a laptop computer and a laser identification badge creator.

In other matters, Director of Public Utilities Bill Anderson asked the board to approve nearly \$700,000 worth of capital improvement projects. The trustees, however, ended up giving the green light to expenditures totaling \$308,080.

Anderson listed 15 public utilities projects in order of priority for the board's consideration. At the top was \$175,000 to "rehabilitate" 2,200 feet of aging sewer line near Innsbrook Apartments on Seven Mile.

The trustees decided that the project could wait for another year, as could a lot of other items on the list. The biggest line items the board did approve included:

- \$38,000 for payments on the lease of a vactor truck.
- \$20,380 for a new replacement vehicle for Anderson.

The board also continued to

move forward on bringing the township's administration into the computer age.

"We've been in the stone age long enough here," Supervisor Karen Baja said. "It'll be nice to stop using a hammer and chisel."

Earlier in February the trustees approved spending up to \$5,000 for the services of computer consultant David Doyle. This time around they also gave approval for \$15,000 for the purchase of equipment and computer programs.

Manager Tamara Hanlin, working in conjunction with Doyle, has recommended a two-phase computer changeover for the township. The first phase will involve buying computers and software for individual work stations, the aim being to improve productivity and efficiency.

Once the dust settles from that change, Doyle will participate in evaluating the larger and longer-term technological needs of the township, including linking computers together.

His cost estimate for phase one ranges from \$17,600 to \$22,500, depending on what equipment and training the board wants to buy.

The trustees authorized only the \$15,000 allocated in the current capital budget, however. Hanlin said that the amount was "very workable," noting that falling computer prices ensure phase one costs come in at or under the \$15,000 mark.

Hanlin said she will try to bring bids back to the board for the equipment and software by as soon as April. She added she's hoping the new technology could in place by July.

The board and Hanlin decided to deal with phase two expenses in the next budget year. The cost will be, in her words, "a big-ticket item."

Doyle estimated that the total cost will be in the ball park of \$135,000.

## Bill would limit commission meetings

Township civil service commissions would have to meet quarterly instead of monthly, under a bill before the Michigan House of Representatives.

"In Redford Township, the civil service commission doesn't always have things to do," said freshman state Rep. James Ryan, R-Redford, sponsor of House Bill 4293.

"There's no point paying them to come to a required meeting and then sending them home."

Thus bill changes the meetings to quarterly. If the chair or any member wants, they can meet oftener," Ryan said.

HB 4293 was approved in minutes recently by the House Local

Government Committee and sent to the House floor. Action is expected any day.

last year, but the Senate was unable to take it up before the session's end.

Committee chair Robert Brackenridge, R-St. Joseph, said Ryan's predecessor, Rep. Richard Young, D-Dearborn Heights, got the same measure through the House late

Ryan said the bill amends the law governing both general law and charter townships.

Only a few, large, urban townships will be affected, he added.

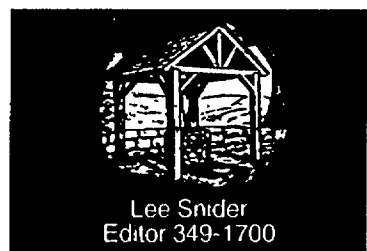

### Reaction to prison plan showed poise

The Northville Township Board of Trustees showed uncharacteristic savvy in dealing with the state's recent request to allow double bunking at the Western Wayne Correctional Facility.

The state wants to increase the prison population from its current 500 to roughly 775, but under the terms of a binding preexisting agreement, must first obtain the permission of Northville Township officials.

It's no mystery as to why the state wants to double bunk. Michigan's prison population is burgeoning and Gov. John Engler is asking for \$200 million for expansion and new construction.

In the meantime, the state wants to make use of what space it has, including putting second bunks in some prison cells.

But before they can do that, at least where Western Wayne is concerned, they need Northville Township's approval.

And they want it badly.

Instead of reacting in knee-jerk fashion to the state's proposal to increase the inmate population at Western Wayne, township elected representatives indicated that approval could be forthcoming if the compensation is right.

The township is testing the waters to see what it can get in return for its blessing to double bunk. They are asking that the state either: 1) demolish the vacant Phoenix prison and sell the property to get the land on to the tax roles; 2) allow the township to purchase the Phoenix property and sell it as an income-producing investment; or 3) ease deed restrictions on Seven Mile property near the State Police Post the

state gave the township in 1991.

There's no word yet on whether the state will agree to any of these proposals. Township officials have given their offers to Sen. Robert Geake and asked him to take them back to state officials for review.

If the state agrees to any of the three conditions, we believe the township will come out ahead. Double bunking, a practice already in use at Scott Correctional located across from Western Wayne, is not an unusual corrections approach and can be accomplished at no loss of security. In most cases, the state can proceed with double bunking without first obtaining the permission of the local government, but due to an agreement between the state and the township when double bunking was proposed for Scott, the township is in a position to make demands upon the state.

Suggestions of double bunking can produce reactions of anxiety and fear, leading officials to take a position of obstinate resistance. Fortunately, township officials have responded with level-headed calm and given careful thought as to how they can make use of the situation to gain material benefit for their constituents.

Just what the township's move should be in the event the state rejects the three proposals isn't clear, but we would suggest a series of negotiations rather than a refusal to cooperate.

### Bennett a good choice for school board post

The Northville Board of Education has tabbed school district activist Barb Bennett to replace former trustee Pat Custer, who left the board for personal reasons Feb. 13. Bennett will serve until this year's school board election in June, at which time the unexpired portion of Custer's term - one year - will be up for grabs among candidates running for that seat.

In 1996, hopefuls will run for the same position for a full four-year term.

Bennett was an obvious - and a good - choice to serve as interim trustee and we commend the school board on their selection.

Bennett, whose four sons are enrolled in the local school system, has a strong commitment to the district and is active at many levels. She keeps a close watch on school board developments, attending meetings regularly and participating in volunteer activities.

She impressed many with her depth of knowledge while a member of the Future Facilities Use Subcommittee, the group that conducted a comprehensive study of the district's physical properties and recommended the opening of Thornton Creek last September.

Despite her energy and involvement, we were unable to endorse Bennett

when she ran for the school board in 1994, saying that she needed additional experience to round out her understanding of the district's K-12 program. She finished third in the balloting, behind eventual trustees Martha Nield and Tom Gudritz.

Since June of last year, Bennett has remained a keen student of public education.

The one criticism we heard concerning Bennett's appointment was that her selection could give her an advantage should she make a second bid for a board of education seat this June. Bennett said she has not yet decided if she'll run.

That could, in fact, be a side effect of Bennett's appointment but we think the reasons recommending her selection far outweigh this potential complication. In point of fact, Bennett is qualified, committed and eager to become further involved. We think the district will be well served by her participation.

### Wanted: One parade organizer

Ice and snow still blanket the ground and that all-too-familiar winter nip has yet to leave the air but it's not too early to think about July - July 4th, to be exact.

Former Independence Day parade organizer Debbie McDonald is searching for someone to pass the baton to but she's starting to get a little nervous; the weeks are mounting quickly.

"It's very important to start organizing early," she says. "The bands get snapped up real soon."

McDonald worked tirelessly on the parade from 1991-94, raising money and lining up an army of entertainers and volunteers for the famed annual event. More than 100 groups and 1,000 people normally participate in the parade.

Though the Early Bird Kiwanis Club technically was the organizing unit, McDonald did the lion's share of the nuts and bolts work.

But the owner of Northville Diamond Jewelers says her business is expanding and her commitments to other organizations just keep piling up. She can't keep pace with it all.

"My business demands more of my time every year. I get involved in so many things in town."

McDonald is currently the vice president of the Chamber of Commerce and a member of the Mother's Club.

Typically, the civic-minded McDonald doesn't want to pull out of the parade until she sees that someone reliable is willing to step in and take charge. So far, no takers.

What does heading up the organization of the parade entail?

The organizing person or club has to, among other things, oversee the raising of about \$4,000 to stage the event. Now, that might not be as bad as it sounds, especially if things go the way they did in 1994.

According to McDonald, both the city and township contributed funds for the parade for the first time last year. The money they provided came close to making up the entire parade budget, so there was no need to hold fund-raising promotions. It was the first time, McDonald said, that it wasn't necessary to go to the community and ask for donations.

It isn't known if the two municipal governments will kick in money again this year. McDonald said she was given no assurances that the funds would continue to be forthcoming and was told that each year would be treated on a case-by-case basis. She hopes officials will find enough scratch in the kitty to finance the parade again this year.

As far as signing up the performers is concerned, that should be fairly routine. McDonald has developed a master list of marchers, musical acts and novelty performers who more or less expect to participate each year. Of course, she'll be happy to pass the information along to whoever comes forward to head up the parade. I'm sure she'll also provide pointers to help her successor get started.

McDonald says organizing the mammoth event is a big job but is more blessing than burden.

"It's a great feeling the day of the parade to hear all those people cheering. It's a lot of work and pain but you get a lot of satisfaction out of it."

### Count on community in a pinch

It's enough to make you wonder if the need for health care and insurance company reform isn't immediate and critical. Once again a local resident fighting cancer is in need of a treatment for which an insurance company won't pay.

Again, it's the community that's helping out in a time of need.

For the moment, the community is setting aside the issues of why the insurance company won't cover the costs and is stepping up to the job of raising the money to make sure the resident gets the necessary treatment.

So far, the community's doing pretty well too, having raised \$44,000 at last report. A fund-raising dinner at Northville High School last week brought the intake so far to that level. And another \$15,000 has been raised through the spouse's work associates.

But there is still a long way to go, since the treatment will cost \$160,000. So the efforts continue.

Novi resident Kathy Karney is battling a metastasized breast cancer. She underwent a mastectomy in 1991, but doctors told her last summer the cancer had returned and spread to lymph nodes in her lungs and into her femur bone.

Her doctors have recommended Karney undergo a self-donating bone marrow procedure at Duke Univer-

sity in North Carolina, but Blue Cross/Blue Shield has rejected the claim on the grounds the procedure is experimental for breast cancer patients.

That's a terrible frustration. Here we are, living in the country that has the brightest medical minds in the world and is leading the way in medical advancement. So procedures that can save lives are available today that weren't around a few short years ago.

But this country also has the most stringent testing procedures in the world, and the result is that those people who want to take advantage of the medical advances have to run the risk of personal financial ruin.

That's exactly what we thought health insurance was supposed to protect against.

Regardless, the important thing right now is to get Karney into treatment. Donations are being funneled through a non-profit organization in Birmingham called My Friends Care, a group that helps cancer patients in need of bone marrow transplants, and any amount raised over what is needed by Karney will go to that group. Those who would like to make a donation can call 349-5564.

Once again, this community can be proud of itself for lending a helping hand to one of its members.

## Committee has diverse members

Second, all of us are committed to provide recommendations that not only benefit the school system, but also benefit the community.

We are focusing on ways that community members will be able to take advantage of the computers, networks, and software within the schools.

We are looking at ways that the school system should be tied into the new public library computers.

And we are evaluating student projects that should be developed that will provide services to the community and local businesses.

If it is decided that community residents will be asked to approve an enhancement millage, we want to provide some way that all community members can benefit from the investment. Finally, it is important to know

that we realize that just adding more computers is not the answer.

We are not just counting the classrooms we have and, therefore, how many computers we need. We have determined that issues such as school staff and administration commitment, personnel allocation, and most importantly, curriculum enhancement and continuity are the major building blocks that need to be in place for technology to accomplish its goals of better preparing Northville students to compete in the real world.

# Where's business in education debate?

Two items recently in the news demonstrate how dangerous it is to mix what our kids learn in school with the ambitious whimsy of night-wing politics.

Item One: Although scores on Michigan Educational Assessment Program (MEAP) exams show general improvement over last year, less than half of Michigan students who took the mandatory statewide test last fall did satisfactory work in math and reading.

"Overall, the scores are good, but not good enough," said state school Superintendent Robert Schiller. "I'm quite pleased that the schools are taking the test seriously. They're doing a lot of work aligning their curriculum with the test."

Here we have the MEAP test doing precisely what school reformers, both Republican and Democratic, have advocated for years: Providing a single statewide standard by which each school can judge how its students are doing and make adjustments if necessary for improvement.

Item Two: The Senate Education Committee recently approved a bill to allow two dozen school districts to opt out of statewide exams and write their own proficiency tests.

Why? The stated reason is it will strengthen schools because "it allows the locals to go beyond state standards," according to Sen. Leon Stille, R-Spring Lake, who joined two other GOP senators in approving the bill on a 3-2 party-line vote.

Hogwash! Here we have nothing less than a brazen attempt to rip up any objective measurement of educational achievement. If every district is to pick its own proficiency test, how will employers judge a graduate's skill level? How will parents - operating in the "school marketplace," so powerfully advocated by Gov. John Engler - pick one school over another?

This stuff is getting serious.

This newspaper led the way in fighting to obtain and publish the

MEAP scores in this district, building by building, school by school. No single thing this newspaper has done over the past decade has aroused as much parental interest and reader comment.

Making the MEAP test results public has helped - forced, some would say - schools to focus on what their students actually learn and how they stack up against others. Courses are getting changed and toughened; scores are going up.

After reviewing last year's test results, state Department of Education consultants urged that teachers give more attention to adding more geometry to math courses, spending more time on informational reading and less on fiction, providing periods of sustained silent reading and learning fewer science concepts but in more depth.

Sound like mushy "edubabble"? Not at all. It's good, conservative, common sense applied to our schools.

So what's behind all the nonsense?

Pandering, for one thing, to the folks who want to spend public tax money on private and parochial schools. This is not some abstraction. Just last week, three Republican senators quietly introduced a resolution to remove the Michigan Constitution's ban on parochial.

I can see, hear, feel, think, say and do - I have the tools to survive, to be close to others, to be productive, and to make sense and order out of the world of people and things outside of me.

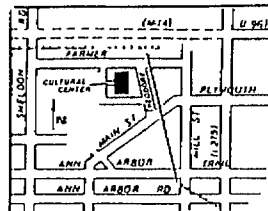
I own me, and therefore, I can engineer me.

I am me and I am okay.

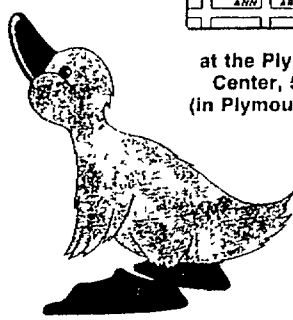

"We would like a nice safe place to go without worrying."

Pedestrians who skate in the area are often in danger from motorists who drive too quickly and don't pay attention, the boys said. Curbs that are easy to trip

over are another hazard, according to Andrew.

# Northville gets grant money for city parks

bids for the job by the end of April or the beginning of May and have the entire project completed by the end of the summer.

However, the time table is not set in stone, she said. The Recreation Department is required to match at least 25 percent of the DNR's grant to bring the total investment in the new courts to \$133,000.

Plans for the project - which will include pulling out the existing asphalt, digging up the soil underneath, and adding limestone and a drainage system - are waiting for approval from the DNR.

A poor drainage system and a lack of maintenance was what led to the court's recent demise, Johnson said. Ongoing maintenance after the repairs are completed is a priority, she said.

In addition to receiving funds to repair the tennis courts, the recreation department will also be awarded a \$40,000 community development block grant to purchase new playground equipment. The last of the old equipment was removed last fall.

"The old equipment was really outdated," Johnson said. "Nobody ever played on it."

The playground, which will

include a climbing structure and swing sets, will be barrier free, Johnson said.

Johnson's department has also received preliminary approval for a grant that will allow the city of Northville to purchase 2.8 acres of land on Griswold Street near Ford Field in order to expand the park. The \$150,000 grant is awaiting approval by the state Legislature.

Currently, the plot of land is owned by R&D Enterprises, the industrial firm that moved into the former Ford Valve Plant on Main Street in November. R&D leases the land to the city of Northville, which sub lets the tract to McDonald Ford to park cars on.

Once the land is purchased by the city, Johnson said the city hopes to use it for ground-level parking in addition to expanding the park area.

Currently, the Northville Planning Commission is working on a master plan for Ford Field, which will be presented to the city council sometime in March.

Residents could see bike paths through the area along the Rouge River, a fishing dock and possibly a bridge connecting Mill Race Historical Village and Ford Field.

# State wants to double bunk inmates

let the state begin housing women at the Scott Regional Correctional Facility, located in Northville Township on Five Mile near Beck, and double bunk there as well. The state Legislature passed a law authored by Geake and State Rep. Gerry Law, R-Plymouth, that among other things capped the number of inmates at Western Wayne at 500.

Northville Township went to court and received an injunctive order backing up the law as well, which means that it alone can grant permission for the state to repeal the cap. That's something that Engler and DOC officials are very interested in getting, Geake said.

"They want it badly and they want it desperately," he said.

That puts the board in an enviable bargaining position. The trustees used it to advantage, rejecting the state's initial proposal and demanding a sweeter offer.

State officials, Geake explained, are willing to tear down the closed Phoenix Correctional Facility, located just west of Scott. The state would pay for an expensive clean up of Phoenix's 63 acres, he added, and then sell the land to the private sector, getting it back on the tax rolls.

The offer didn't tantalize the trustees, however. Most expressed doubts that the state would follow through on the project if the board agreed to it. They said that when the state wants something their officials are long on promise and short on delivery.

"I know how the state works," Trustee Gini Britton said. "Is it going to happen in our lifetime?" Even granting that written lan-

guage could be worked out to guarantee that the state would do what it says, the trustees continued, the deal still doesn't promise much benefit for the township.

Northville would get only a fraction of the total tax revenue on the 63-acre parcel, the board noted. Getting any revenue at all, however, requires that a developer buy the property, which is located next to two prisons and a park.

Supervisor Karen Baja said she's asked the state to consider giving the township some land in exchange for the OK to double bunk at Western Wayne but the idea was nixed. Board members proposed a variety of options the state could offer that would win their votes. They included:

- Releasing the township from the terms of its contract of owner-

ship of 16 acres on Seven Mile near the Michigan State Police post. Acquired in 1991 in the Scott deal, the township can't sell the land and can use it only for certain purposes and with a number of conditions.

The trustees asked Geake to see if the state would let the township own the land without any strings, clearing the way for its eventual sale.

- Giving Phoenix to the township. The board discussed the possibility of gradually paying for tearing down the buildings and then rehabilitating the land for public use, possibly as an extension of Beck Road park.

- Letting the township buy the rehabilitated land from the state for public/recreational use.

### PLEASANT DREAMS

Patients can take steps to halt neck, back, or shoulder pain that interrupts sleep by altering their sleeping positions and using pillows for support. One pillow placement that will not help involves wedging it under the back so as to raise one hip higher than the other. A better strategy is to lie on your back and place pillows beneath your head and knees. A wedge-shaped pillow works best to elevate the knees and relieve pressure on the lower back. If neck pain is a problem, use a contour pillow that cradles the head and neck, and prevents tilting. Another good pain-relieving position is lying on your side, with pillows beneath your head and between your knees.

## COMING OUT OF THE CLOSET

What do a mink and a ferret have in common? A mink hangs in a closet and, up until just a few months ago, that's where Michigan ferret owners had to keep their pets.

Thanks to Gov. John Engler, who signed the bill in December allowing ferrets to be kept as pets, many ferret lovers can now come out of the closet.

With legalization comes educational efforts to debunk the myths attached to the animal. It is not a rodent, and ferrets have lost most of their wild instincts and do not hunt small game.

A ferret is the only domesticated member of Mustelidae family, whose undomesticated side of the family are the otter, rank mink, skunk, ermine and weasel.

Ferrets were domesticated hundreds of years before the cat. The term "ferreting out" comes from a time when they were used in Europe to chase rabbits out of the burrow on a hunt.

Locally, there are probably a dozen ferrets enjoying home and hearth with a handful of families.

For Carol Livermore, her discovery of the little mink-like creature happened while taking a stroll through the sands of a beach in Florida.

"We were in Naples walking the beach and I saw someone walking one. I had never heard of one or seen one," said Livermore.

The Northville resident stopped the woman and asked about what she thought was a mink at the end of the leash. The wheels began to turn inside Livermore's head after talking with the woman about her pet ferret. Livermore's daughter was allergic to cats but had been bugging her for a pet.

"They don't bark, whine or meow, so I thought this is a perfect pet for us," she said.

Because her stay in Florida was temporary due to her husband's business and they knew they would be returning to Michigan soon, she had the foresight to inquire about the legality of ferrets in Michigan. Before buying one, she contacted the Department of Natural Resources.

She was told at that time that the ferret issue was under consideration by a legislative committee, and that they were not prosecuting people who owned ferrets. They were, however, prosecuting people who were illegally selling them.

"I felt confident that we wouldn't go to jail or anything."

Then it was off to the pet store for the Livermore family where they purchased their first ferret, Duke of Earl.

"Duke was such a good ferret," said Livermore. She soon discovered that two ferrets is double the fun, so it was back to the pet store.

"If you have ferrets you have to have more than one because they get lonely and they are so playful." All the family, including Duke, went down to the pet store to pick out Duke's sister, Duchess.

"They really entertain each other and play," she said. "In the middle of the day I'll go in the bedroom and they'll be in my bed under the covers like a pretzel curled up together, so they really do need each other."

Duke is now one and a half years old and is full grown at about five pounds. Duchess is 11 months and weighs less than three pounds.

In a 24-hour period, ferrets will sleep 15 to 20 hours. But as soon as they're awake, they're up and going. They are very inquisitive and need the freedom to roam and play and require the supervision of the owner.

"They don't make any noise, that's why I have a bell on them," said Livermore. Duke has a blue collar with one bell and Duchess has a pink collar with two bells.

Livermore was well prepared to take on the responsibilities of ferret ownership.

"They are not for everybody," she said. "You need to research and read up on them and find out whether you're ferret material." She highly recommends *Ferrets, a Complete Pet Owners Manual* by Chuck and Fox Morton.

Like cats, ferrets are small, quiet and easy to care for. Like dogs, they enjoy being around people. Unlike both, a ferret will retain its youthful nature well into old age, about 8 to 10 years.

"Ferrets are very inquisitive. They have to be in to everything. When they are awake they spend all their energy. From the time they're up to the time they pass out, they are in perpetual motion," said Livermore.

Since Livermore has completely ferret-proofed her house and has no small children or pets, she feels comfortable letting them have the run of the place during the day. But at night she shuts them in the kitchen where they sleep in their cage. She has fashioned a hammock which is strung from either side of the cage and they sleep together.

A ferret can squeeze through an opening as small as 1 inch by 2 inches, so ferret-proofing a house is a must before it ever comes home. Livermore remodeled her kitchen but a small hole in the baseboard had not been finished. Duchess squeezed into the hole and couldn't get out.

"I had to rip the whole baseboard out with the crowbar," she said.

"You have to discipline them like you would a child," said Livermore. "Duke likes to rough house and play, but won't bite down." Livermore uses a little flick on the snout along with a sharp "no" to discourage unwanted behavior.

The list of antics the little mammals have managed to accumulate is growing by the day.

"He's a little brighter than she is," Livermore said, but added that both pets have unique personalities. Ferrets use their snouts and hands to open doors or drawers, so they can get into just about anything that's not securely locked.

"Duke likes to go in the bathroom so he will open the drawer, sort of like a raccoon with his hands," she said. He sleeps on the bottom shelf in amongst the cotton balls. Duchess likes to curl up in a sweater drawer to take a much needed snooze.

Once, Duchess took Livermore's granddaughter's bottle out of the bottom cupboard and started running with it.

"You want to see something funny - you see a ferret running through the house with a bottle hanging out of its mouth. It's hilarious."

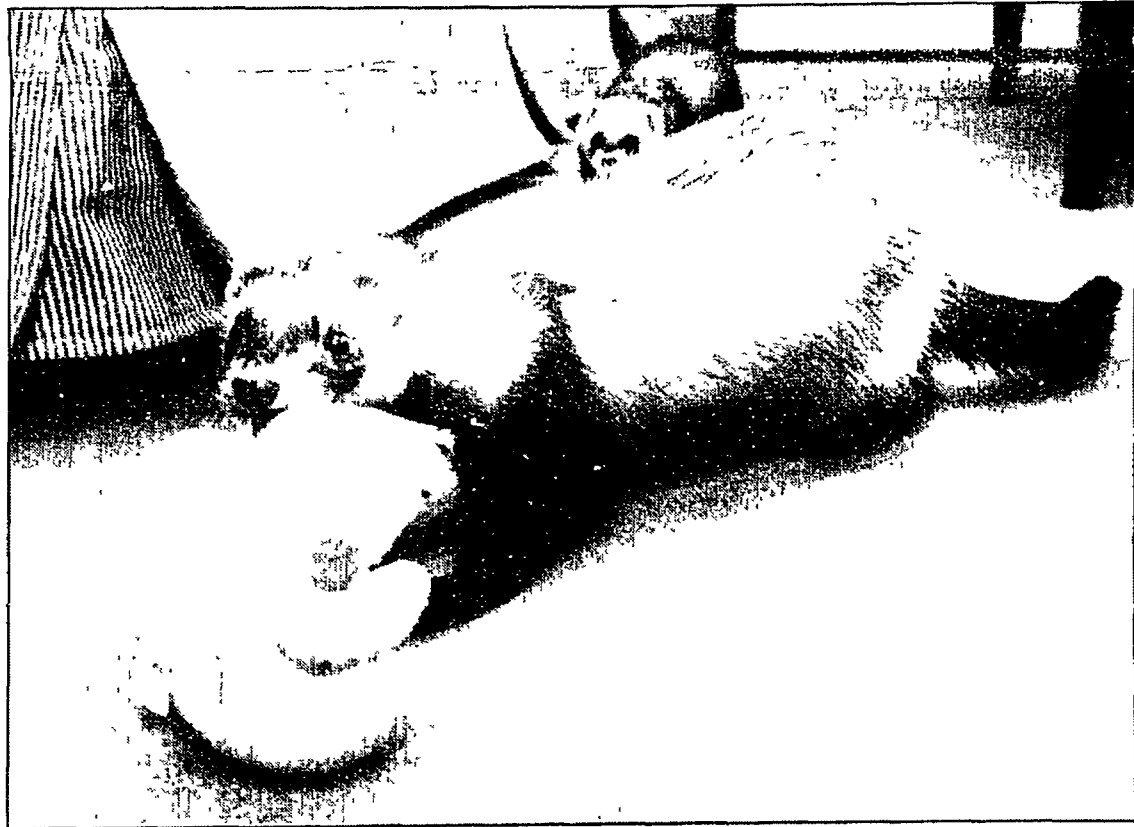
"Occasionally they'll decide they don't want my books in the bookcase and they will pull them all out," she said.

True to form, they will ferret away anything they can take. "They'll take things out of your purse or if guests are visiting, out of their suitcase and hide them. They are very strong. One took the broom out of the kitchen and took it upstairs and hid it under my bed," Livermore said.

Although they are litter trainable just like a cat, unlike a cat they require multiple boxes or pet papers due to their digestive systems. "They don't have time to run downstairs to use the litter box," she said. "They go to the bathroom quite often so if you don't litter train them you're in big trouble."

A ferret can also be trained to respond to its name and do tricks.

Hazards the ferret faces usually come at the hands of their owners. Because they like to tunnel into rugs, clothes, beds, chairs and couches, owners must always remember to check before plopping themselves down anywhere.

Ferrets are also susceptible to human colds. Leisure Time Pet Center owner Bill Wisniewski has ordered his first dozen ferrets but is waiting on state inspection and approval.

"A special license is needed to carry puppies, bunnies, kittens and now ferrets," he said. If all goes according to plan, his ferrets will be in the store at 42951 Seven Mile in Northville at the Highland Lakes Shopping Center by mid-March.

All the ferrets he receives will be neutered, which is required by law, he said. The price range is \$200 to \$300.

"The biggest thing is to ferret-proof your house," he said. "Make sure there are no small holes they can get into and watch where you sit."

"They are attentive like a dog but not as uppity as a cat," he said. "There is a leash law, so they have to be on a leash while outside."

### A word from the vets...

It took the Department of Natural Resources a long time to legalize ferrets as domestic pets, according to Joe Osbourne, DVM, because at one time there was no approved rabies vaccine. Now there is.

The second concern of the DNR was that a wild ferret population might develop and impact other wildlife. Most of its hunting instincts have been bred out and the life expectancy of a ferret, should it escape, is fairly brief.

Before purchasing a ferret, check around for a vet who handles ferrets, because not all do.

"I know some vets who won't see them because they don't feel comfortable around them," said Osbourne, whose office is in the Meadowbrook Veterinary Clinic.

"They're not like a cat where you can let them roam around the house all day. They have to be caged when they are not supervised because they tend to get into a lot of trouble. They chew on things like electrical cords. They go up into the furniture and chew on the stuffing."

"Some people give them little toys to chew on and they can swallow these things. They are nibblers, their mouth is always going. That's just their

nature," he said.

"They're usually zigging and zagging all over the place," added Dr. Andrea Maceri of the West Oaks Veterinary Clinic. Maceri doesn't advise that families with small children to leave ferrets unsupervised.

Females must be spayed or will die of estrogen toxicity. Females will go into heat and if not bred, will eventually die when the estrogen level builds up and causes aplastic anemia.

"A tattoo is an indicator that the ferret has been spayed or neutered," said Dr. Maceri. Maceri recommends that you don't take any chances and ask whether the ferret has been neutered or spayed.

According to Osbourne, "it's the nature of the beast" to have a musky odor, but that decreases considerably when the animal is neutered or spayed.

"Ferrets do need veterinary care perhaps more than some other types of pets for vaccines, physical and dental care," said Maceri. They should also be vaccinated yearly for rabies and canine distemper.

Osbourne recommends a ferret food or a good quality kitten chow, not cat food. "They need the higher protein and fat," she said.

Local veterinarians knowledgeable about ferrets include West Oaks Veterinary Clinic, Meadowbrook Veterinary Clinic, Millstream Animal Clinic, Northville Veterinary Clinic, and the Novi Veterinary Clinic.

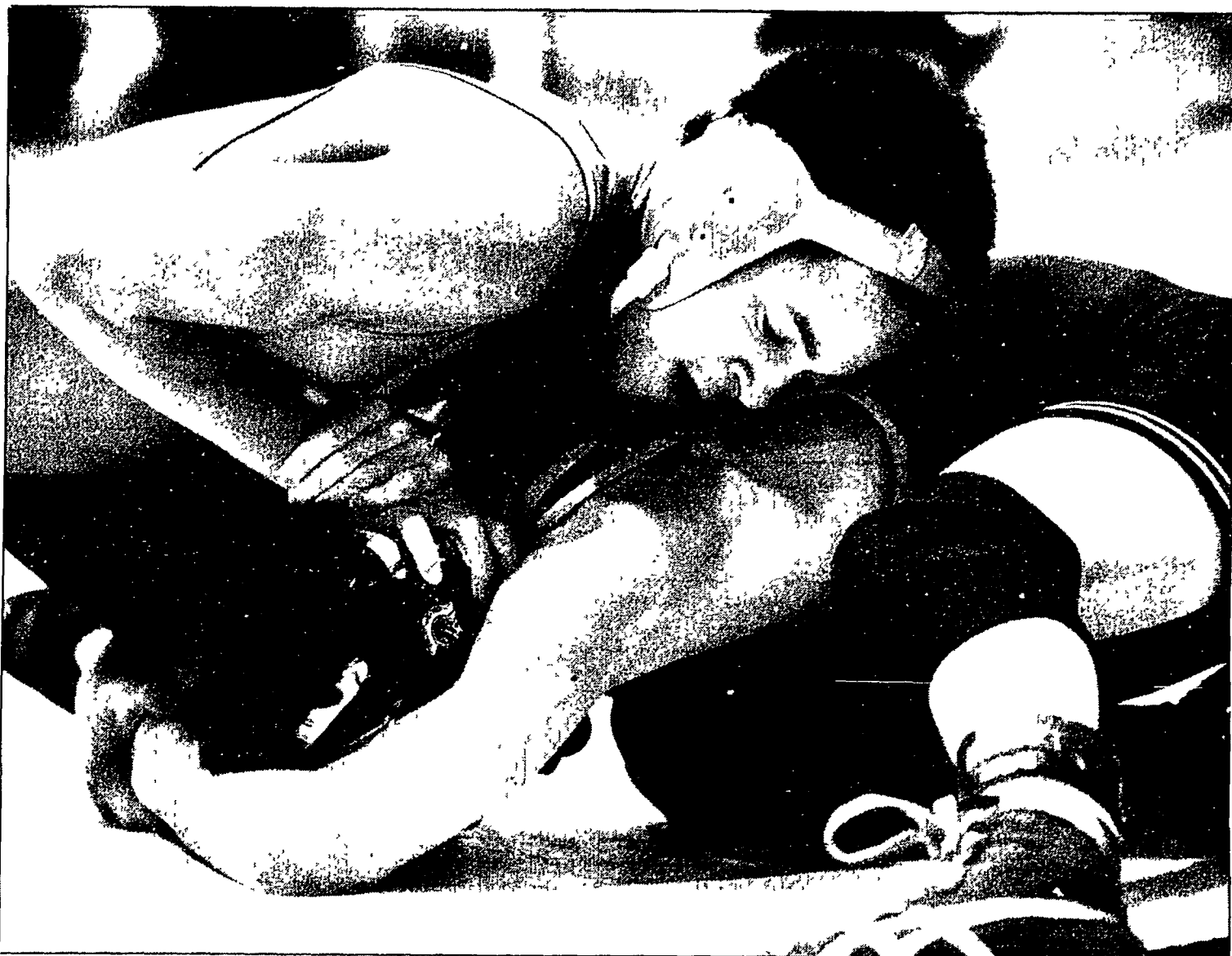

Essary had Northville/Novi's top score of the day. She scored a 9.35 on the uneven bars and took sec-

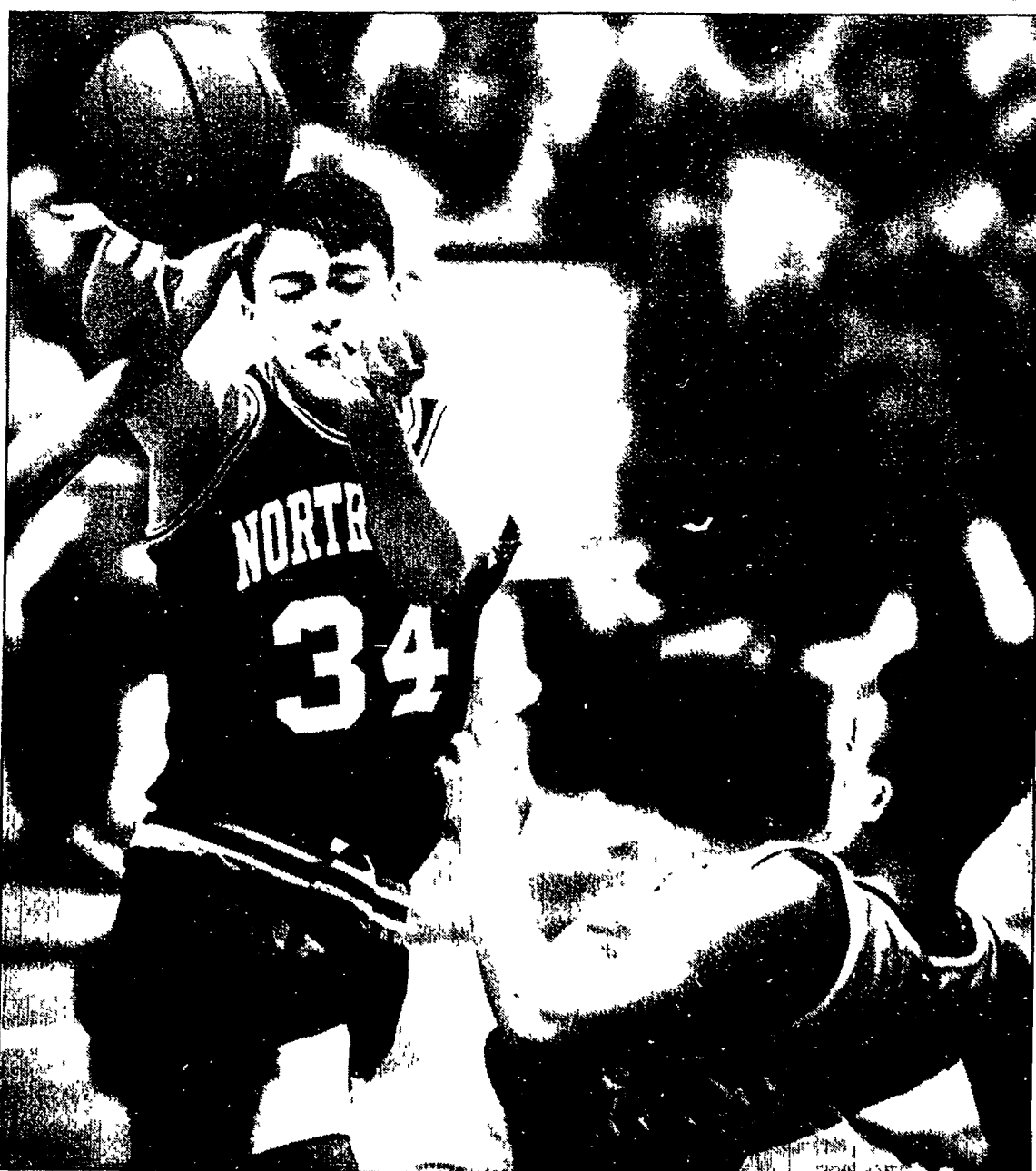

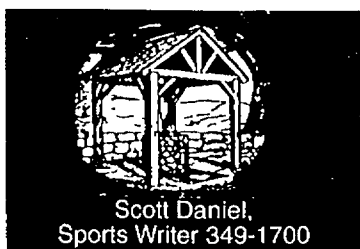

refreshments, flowers, photos prizes for everyone, comfortable seating and great music by D. J. Willie. The event is limited to 275 people, so buy your tickets early.

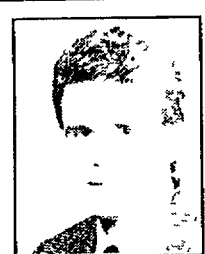

## First 56 days of pregnancy most important

An injury during this time, whether it is nutritional, drug-related or from an infection, can affect the fetus. Most structural abnormalities develop by the eighth week after conception. That's why it's important for couples not yet pregnant to learn about the potential influ-

ences of their lifestyles and general health on the developing fetus. Preconception counseling is a relatively new idea. It addresses issues of nutrition, smoking, alcohol and drug use, exposure to toxic substances, medical illness and genetic conditions in both parents.

The major goal of preconception counseling is to provide the facts to help people make an informed decision about having a baby. With the appropriate information, a decision can be made to accept the increased risks a pregnancy poses, to modify the risks or to forgo childbearing.

Preconception counseling has three components. It helps identify individual risks, it provides personalized and non-judgmental education and finally, if appropriate, it facilitates access to counseling or diet and behavior-modification programs.

Another benefit to counseling is that people can confront, in advance, any potentially diffi-

cult decisions they may face. It gives them time to work through the moral and ethical dilemmas associated with a fetal malformation. If such a situation occurs, people are more likely to be at ease with any decision they eventually make. Although there are many advantages to preconception counseling and health promotion, there are disadvantages as well. Counseling may heighten anxiety, reinforce guilt, lead to false guarantees and detract rather than enhance personal decision-making.

This planning is a very important part of the pregnancy. Offering these services has the potential of making childbearing a more rewarding experience for a woman, her family and society.

## Intense exercise may reduce colds, flu

and avoiding people with fever, chills, congestion and coughs.

Scientists have shown that the human body responds in similar ways to both intense exercise and infection. For example, when the body temperature rises, there are increases in the number of infection-fighting white blood cells in the circulation. Moreover, blood concentrations of iron and zinc decrease.

Some physiologists now believe that, because joggers and other physically active people increase their body temperatures by about 4

degrees Fahrenheit with vigorous exercise, they may be less likely to get sick. Known as "jogging fever," this increase in body temperature may actually help to destroy invading bacteria.

The exercise-induced increase in white blood cells also is likely to be beneficial in reducing infections. White blood cells function like "Pac-Man," gobbling up foreign bacteria, viruses and related toxins.

Regular exercise is also associated with lower blood levels of iron and zinc, which further serves to inhibit bacterial growth. Athletes have lower iron and zinc levels, and that may account for their claims of fewer illnesses.

There are no definitive studies — yet — to prove that physically active people get sick less often than their sedentary counterparts, but the evidence appears promising.

**Q. Are there any prescription drugs that can lower cholesterol?**

A. The U.S. Food and Drug Administration has approved a prescription drug called lovastatin which markedly lowers total cholesterol and the particularly dangerous low-density lipoprotein (LDL) cholesterol in the blood. The

drug is marketed as the brand name Mevacor. It is recommended for people who have been unable to lower their elevated blood cholesterol by diet alone.

**Q. What's more important in determining body fatness — heredity or environment?**

A. Heredity. Adult adoptees have been shown to resemble their biological more than their adoptive parents in the degree of body fatness. This highlights the importance of genetic influences over family environment in determining adult obesity.

**Q. If I can control my cholesterol, what are my chances of avoiding heart disease?**

A. Heart disease is virtually nonexistent in individuals with blood cholesterol levels of less than 150.

Northville was shocked in game two, 15-0. Knowing they wouldn't move on from pool play took all the fight out of her team, Murray said.

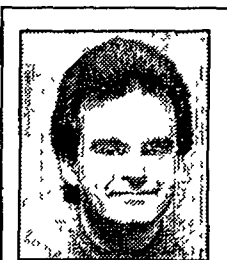
"Nobody cared," she said bluntly. After pool play, Western Lakes honors were handed out.

### Home design, remodeling going the high-tech route

Planning to build a new home, remodel your present home or redesign your landscaping?

Hiring professional designers can be expensive. But now, thanks to recently developed computer programs, you can handle the initial phase of the planning process yourself — and have fun doing it.

New programs are available that will allow you to map out your design on a computer screen, with the software instantly performing much of the work that would otherwise take hours to accomplish. When completed, you can print out a hard copy.

The copy can be given to an architect or contractor, saving big bucks on planning functions. Or, if your house is for sale, a printed plan of your house and landscaping can be used in a marketing flyer or brochure.

One such program I recently tested provides a computer user

with tools to create a comprehensive home plan. It's basically like sketching the plan on paper. But instead of using a pen or pencil, you draw lines on your computer screen by moving a mouse.

The CD ROM program for Windows I tested is called "Home Design — Gold Edition." It allows the user to draw their home's walls to precise scale proportions — to the nearest inch. Furniture can be positioned by selecting items from a library of 125 professionally drawn pieces.

The program also includes a cost element to help the user estimate and manage costs of a building or remodeling project.

It's particularly useful to families planning a remodeling project. They can take their time in planning the changes, revising the room configuration or dimensions as often as they want. Furniture can be moved about the rooms to see how it all comes together.

### The colonial Dogwood combines new and old

Bookend chimneys flank a totally symmetrical central facade, giving a decidedly colonial flavor to the Dogwood, a large home that blends traditional and contemporary elements.

Following tradition, the plan has a formal entry, with the living room to the left and dining room to the right. A graceful wooden balustrade leads to the four bedrooms on the second floor. But the rest of the home is totally modern. The entry, for instance, has a coat closet and built-in bench. Muddy footwear can be shucked off and stored underneath.

The kitchen, too, is packed with popular amenities. Features here include a sun-filled octagonal nook, garden window, roomy walk-in pantry, built-appliances, and a combination work island/eating bar. The dishwasher is raised to prevent back strain.

The adjacent family room is so large that it has windows facing both the street and back yard. At the rear, French doors open onto a raised deck. A fireplace with a wide brick or tile hearth provides a warm focal point when the air turns nippy.

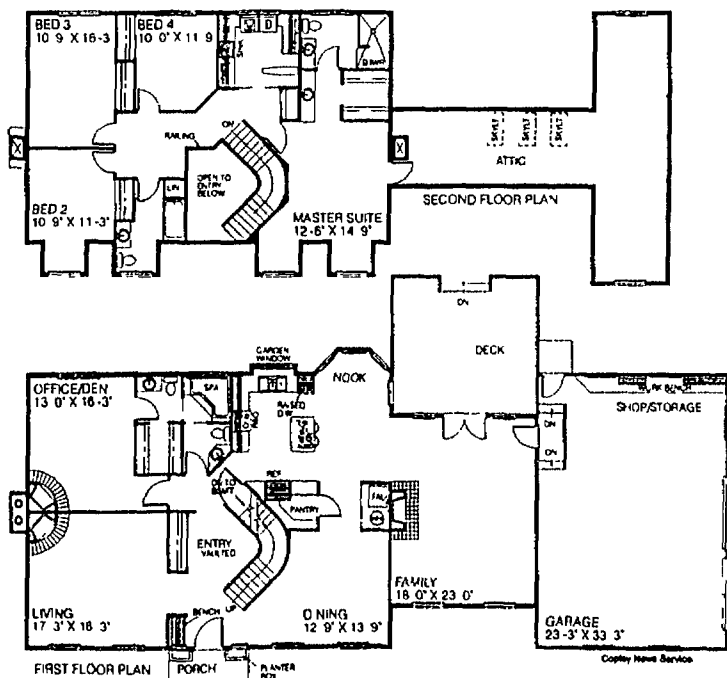
Two more fireplaces feed the

chimney at the far side of the house, one in the living room and the other in a room that could be an office, den or guest room. This room has a small private bathroom separated from a two-person spa by pocket doors. The toilet and lavatory on the other side of the spa serve the rest of the ground floor. Basement stairs are tucked under the ascending stairway.

A landing at the top of the stairs overlooks the entry. The utility room is large and naturally illuminated. It is outfitted with a pull-down ironing board, deep sink, built-in cabinets and plenty of counter space for folding clothes.

Dormers create two sunny alcoves in the master suite. Luxury amenities include a walk-in closet, oversize shower and a second vanity outside the bathroom. The door on the right opens into a huge T-shape attic brightened by skylights. The other three bedrooms share a bathroom with a tub/shower combination.

## MAIL BASHING

Mailbox vandalism — getting them smashed or driven over — is a recurring problem in areas where the mailboxes sit out by the road.

If you've been the victim of a mailbox-smasher, postal authorities suggest several precautionary measures. Among them are setting up a neighborhood watch, picking up your mail at the post office and using only cheap mailboxes.

The first response might be to try to make your box into a vandal-proof fortress. Not a good idea, according to local postmasters.

"It is best to just put a 2-by-4 into the ground and nail your box on top of it," Pinckney Postmaster John Mulligan said. "If a kid decides to go after your mailbox, nothing is going to stop him."

While this is a minor offense by minors, there are certain times that mailbox malice is more likely than others. The worst time for mailbox bashing is at the end of the school year, officials say. Kids feel that they have accomplished something and are looking to celebrate. Other bad times can be nights after big sporting events.

Gregory Postmaster Dale Byrd suggests setting up a neighborhood watch to help keep an eye on each other's boxes. The only person with a right to be in a mailbox is the owner and the mail carrier.

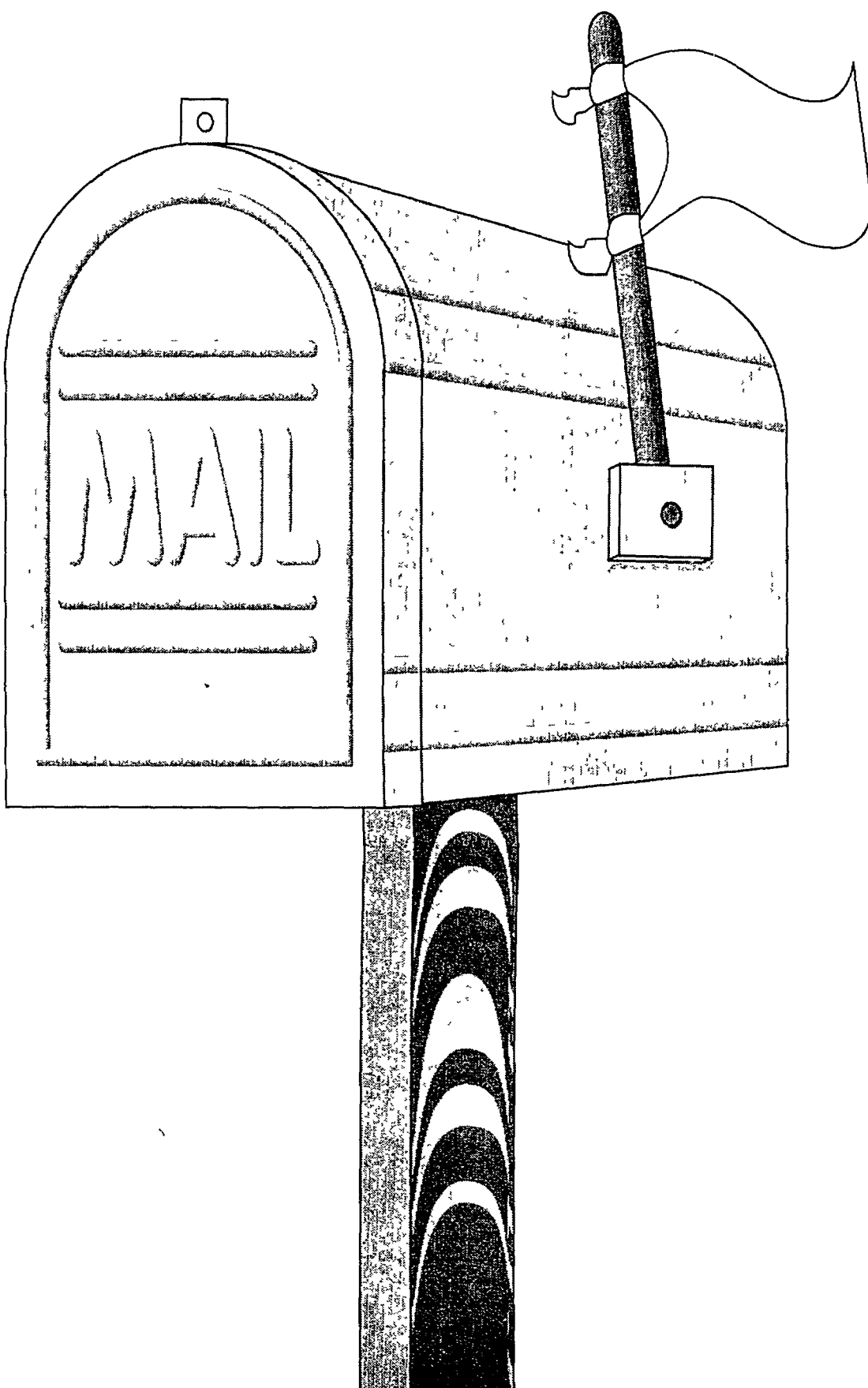
"If you see suspicious cars, you should report the license plates," Byrd said.

Also you should report mailbox damages to the police. The destruction of a mailbox is labeled malicious vandalism. If you report the incident to your local office, they report it to the main postal office. Then they can find offender patterns which help to catch the perpetrators. If mail is lost or stolen as a result of a mailbox bashing, it is a federal offense.

"The post office has exclusive rights to be in that box," Byrd said.

Although people can get very strong and sturdy boxes and poles made, they can cost up to 15 or 20 times the amount of a regular mailbox.

## Overwatering is common mistake

## GARDENING

**Q. How frequently should I water my houseplants?**

A. As often as they need it! But how do you tell? Consult your garden center, florist or plant care tag to determine if your plant is one of the watering exceptions that either needs to dry out between watering or be kept constantly moist. The vast majority of houseplants need water when the surface feels dry to the touch.

Other ways to gauge watering needs include lifting the pot, the lighter the pot, the drier the soil; inserting a probe, if the soil crumbles, the lower soil is still moist, and tapping the pot, a hollow ring means dry soil.

Remember, plant roots need air, too. Overwatering is a common mistake that damages roots and causes yellowing and dropping of lower leaves.

Water thoroughly so water runs out of the pot drainage holes, but empty the saucers so that your plants don't develop overwatering symptoms from sitting in water for extended periods of time — they're not fish!

For some reason people think that plants have to be swimming in water. They must have a day or two to dry

out or they'll drown. Do as I do, water only three times per week. Of course, in the winter, they need even less watering.

**Q. I would like some advice on recipes for organic fertilizers for my houseplants. Since the commercial ones on the market are so dear, they leave a hole in my pocket. I thought you might have some suggestions, especially on the ratios mixing bone meal, blood meal, etc.**

A. The most important advice I can give you is never but never feed your houseplants when they're dormant — they aren't actively growing in winter, and any added nutrients will stay in the soil as a buildup of mineral salts.

Of course, when your houseplants wake up to longer and warmer days of spring, and start putting on new leaves, a nice organic breakfast would be appreciated.

I prefer liquid fertilizers for houseplants because you can adjust the application when you need to. For instance, if the weather turns unseasonably cold and cloudy, and the

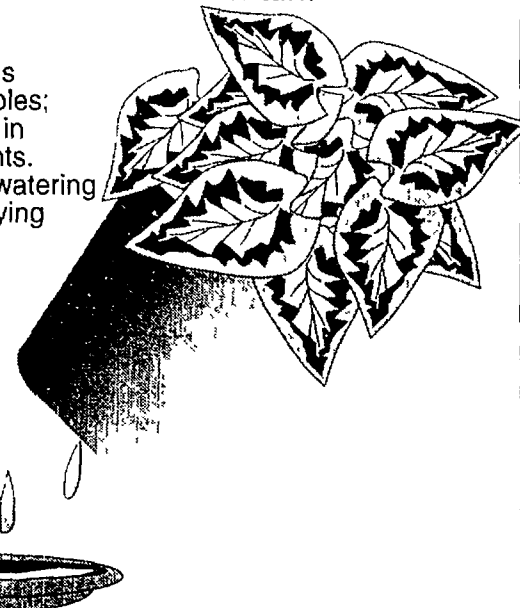
## Watering needs

How can you tell when plants need watering?

Water so that it runs out the drainage holes; do not leave water in saucers under plants. Symptoms of overwatering will appear if no drying period is allowed.



# Prepare metal cabinets before repainting

**Q.** We recently purchased an older home built in the 1950s. We are redoing the kitchen, but we want to retain some of the '50s' look, including the original metal cabinets. They have glass doors and the metal is in fairly good condition, with some scratches and rust spots.

**Is it feasible to paint the metal ourselves? Are there special paints we should use? Can we apply the paint with a roller? I am afraid brushes will leave marks.**

**A.** Metal cabinets can be effectively repainted. There are several paint products on the market made specifically for applications on metal. Rust-Oleum is one major brand. As with any successful paint job, proper preparation of the surface is paramount.

First remove all hardware, i.e., drawer pulls, hinges, etc. Be sure that any of the existing paint that is flaking or peeling is removed. Sand for a smooth finish. Clean the surface thoroughly to be sure that it is free from all grease and oil.

I would suggest washing with a solution of trisodium phosphate (6

tablespoons per gallon of water, plus 1 cup of chlorine bleach. Purchase this from a reputable paint dealer. Rinse with clear water and let dry thoroughly before painting.

Any rusting areas should be sanded and a primer applied before the final coat. Or, you can use a rust reformer applied directly to areas that are lightly or moderately rusted. The rust reformer eliminates the need to sand to bare metal. The brush-on product chemically reacts with the rust, neutralizing and inhibiting its return. The metal can then be primed and painted with meticulous sanding.

An epoxy paint would be your best choice for the kitchen application, as they are abrasion and moisture resistant. Spray-on applications are the most durable,

but great care must be taken with masking and covering the surrounding area to protect from overspray.

A professional spray gun application should be applied in several thin coats. This can be tricky. The application of too much paint during the spraying process will cause runs and drips in the coating. For do-it-yourself applications, it is probably better to use a brush or roller.

As a general rule, the smoother the surface, the shorter the nap of the roller should be. On large areas, paint should be applied to approximately 1 square yard at a

time. Apply the wet roll-off away from the previously coated area and work back to it for uniformity of appearance.

For a very smooth surface appearance, smooth out the rolled-on material with a fine-bristle brush. If the paint consistency is proper, the flow of the paint will fill in any brush marks. Remember that two thin coats of paint are better than one heavy coating.

# Home design, remodeling going the high-tech route

Another new program I tested delivered the same capabilities for the landscaped areas of a residence. Called "Landscape for Windows," it provides the working tools to create a new landscape design or enhancements for an established plan.

The size and proportions of the plan can be precisely keyed to your own lot. Trees, shrubs, flowers, swimming pool, lawn chairs, boulders and other items can be drawn from 200 art elements in the program's library and positioned wherever you want them.

When programs can be helpful to owners considering a remodeling or re-landscaping project. It could even assist the owner reposition home furniture or add

plants to existing landscaping.

They also can be useful when buying a home. The new owner may want to change or add rooms or improve the landscaping. These programs will allow the new owner to see his ideas on the screen or on a printout before getting professional assistance.

There are several excellent computer programs on the market that provide these basic capabilities. Ask about them at your local software store. Both the programs I tested are produced by Expert Software, 800 Douglas Road, Coral Gables, Fla., 33134.

**Q.** Why don't Realtors use the most advanced computer capabilities in marketing properties — techniques that are

now used productively by other businesses?

**A.** The real estate brokerage industry is catching up with rapidly expanding high-tech capabilities. Says Mary Hall, president of the Conejo Valley Association of Realtors in California:

"Gone are the days of local multiple listing services, supplying members with a computerized version of the old printed book of listings."

"Now, innovative real estate communities and professionals are demanding, and getting, the very latest in new electronic services, like on-line color photos and the ability to use a personal computer to electronically manipulate those photos for a variety of marketing purposes."

"We have contracted with a system

known as Computerized Real Estate Information System Network (CRIS-Net), a high-speed telephone data line and a more flexible digital modem. Now our members can access up to 10 photos per listing and transfer the pictures for use in comparative market analyses and other personal computer software programs."

Hall believes the new system will be a benefit to Realtors and agents in her region in performing their marketing responsibilities for property sellers.

"Using a personal computer, we can connect with the MLS and download electronic pictures and data on many listings in a matter of seconds. This rapid transmission makes it possible for the agent to conduct electronic 'tours' for prospective

buyers. And the new system also has a mapping feature that allows the Realtor or agent to print a map showing the location of a house as well as nearby landmarks, such as schools, shopping centers, parks and churches.

"There is no question that the real estate market of the future is going to be replete with all the technology so common in other industries. The only question is how quickly real estate professionals will jump on the bandwagon."

# Organic fertilizers for home use; the best time for repotting plants

plant enters an unexpected holding period; if you're having an infestation of mealybugs or scale and you want to reduce the amount of nitrogen going into plants, you can just use a weaker solution.

And if you want more blooms or if the weather is fabulous and your plants are growing vigorously, you can easily increase the strength.

How can you tell when indoor plants need special nutrients? Here's my trouble-shooting guide:

Lack of nitrogen shows up as

yellow lower leaves, a too light-green color or stunted growth; while plants lacking phosphorus will have purple, red or very dark-green leaves, and their growth will be stunted; too little potassium and the edges and tips of leaves will turn brown and yellow or plants will have weak stems.

A good organic recipe for plants that I use is this: blood meal is about 15 percent nitrogen, bone meal is about 21 percent phosphorus and wood ashes are about 7 percent potassium. Put them all together and you get a great organic fertilizer supplying nitro-

gen, phosphorus and potassium at a ratio of about 5-6-4.

To ensure that your plants get ample nitrogen, give them an occasional extra watering with some fish emulsion. If you shop around, a gallon is about \$10, diluted it should last for years! So apply it once every two weeks when plants are outside for their summer vacation, or make your application half as strong and use it twice as often.

If your plants are nonflowering varieties, and low-light types, fish emulsion is their dish.

Another great fertilizer is compost tea. To make such a tea, sim-

ply steep a cloth bag full of compost in a bucket of water for a couple of weeks until the water turns brown.

And, finally, if this sounds all "too much," keep in mind, according to the advice of many experts, overfertilization kills more plants than underfertilization! Ho-hum!

**Q.** When is the best time to repot plants?

**A.** Spring, of course, is the time to repot neglected houseplants. However, if spring and outdoor gardening activities still seem days away, why not take a look at your

indoor plants now? This is the perfect time to repot and generally spruce up container plants before they begin actively growing again in spring.

It's easy to tell when a plant is root-bound and needs moving to larger quarters. Roots protruding from the bottom of the pot are a dead giveaway, but plants in less-advanced condition may still need repotting.

Look for signs such as wilting, especially soon after watering. This usually indicates that roots have filled up the pot, pushing the soil aside so that the water just runs

through without doing much good. Look also for yellowing and loss of lower leaves or new leaves that are smaller than they ought to be.

Periodically, knock plants out of their pots and examine the root ball. A fine network of roots on the outside of the ball means it's time to repot.

"If someone gets hurt while breaking into your mailbox, you are liable," Byrd said.

Mulligan says that if you live in an area where mailboxes are going to get knocked over, it is best to do it as cheaply and easily as possible.

Nancy Sauvage, the Lakeland postmaster, suggests another solution. "Opening a post office box in the post office is always an option," she said.

# Tiffany lamps have great value



This early Tiffany lamp, based on an ancient Greek oil lamp, is priced at about \$6,000.

**Q:** Enclosed is a photo of an electrified oil lamp that is approximately 80 years old. It is marked "Tiffany Studios — New York." Any information you can give me will be appreciated.

**A:** The design of your lamp, based on ancient Greek oil lamps, is one of Tiffany's earliest models. Kerosene or gas was used to illuminate the shade. This lamp was made around 1900. Prices for Tiffany lamps similar to yours generally begin around \$6,000 and go up.

**Q:** I inherited a service for 12 set of china from my grandmother. The 77 pieces, including the serving dishes, are all in excellent condition. The enclosed mark is on the bottom of each piece.

**Could you tell me the age and value of this set?**

**A:** Your flow-blue dinner set was made by Stanley Pottery Co., in Staffordshire, England. This mark was used from 1928 to 1931. The English registry number shows that the pattern was registered in 1898. Your set would probably be worth about \$5,500 to \$6,000.

**Q:** I have a pottery bowl or vase that I am curious about. I need to know if I should keep it or put it in a garage sale. It is decorated with pink flowers against a green background and has a handle in the shape of a twig.

**The glaze has a smooth, dull finish. On the bottom are the words "Roseville — U.S.A. — 310-10." Can you tell me the age and value of my bowl?**

**A:** Your bowl is usually called Roseville art pottery and is considered highly collectible. George F. Young founded the firm in 1892 in Roseville, Ohio. Utilitarian stoneware, flower pots, and cuspids were the original lines.

Art pottery was not produced until 1898 after they relocated in Zanesville, Ohio. In 1954 production ceased.

The Apple Blossom line first appeared in 1948. It was available in background colors of matte glazes of green, coral and blue with the blossoms in relief. The number "310" is the mold number and "10" is the height in inches. The value of your bowl would probably be about \$135 to \$150.

**Q:** I am interested in learning the value of a child's porcelain tea set given to me as a Christmas present 45 years ago. The pattern is Blue Willow and each piece is marked "Made in

Occupied Japan." It is a service for four and consists of 17 pieces, including a teapot, creamer, sugar bowl, tureen and platter.

**My tea set is in mint condition and still a treasured gift.**

**A:** Objects marked "Occupied Japan" were made after World War II from Sept. 2, 1945, to the end of the American occupation, April 28, 1952.

The value of your Blue Willow tea set would probably be about \$175.

**Q:** I have the complete set of Lenox commemorative plates. They were issued annually from 1970 through 1981. Each of the 12 plates features a Boehm bird.

**Have they increased in value?**

**A:** The 1970 plate was issued at \$35 and is valued at \$140. The remaining plates have risen in price anywhere from a few dollars to \$30 each. The complete set would probably be worth about \$1,000.

**Q:** Could you please tell me something about my electric toaster? It is marked "Universal Patent Nov. 16, 1920 — E 947."

**The toaster is about 7 inches high. It holds two pieces of bread and it does work.**

**What is it worth today?**

**A:** The first electric toasters popped up in 1909. They were manufactured by General Electric and Westinghouse. Other manufacturers soon followed.

Generally those made from 1909 to 1912 that have decorative porcelain bases and overhead warming trays command the highest prices. Your toaster would probably be worth about \$45 to \$65.

## Emily's menu reflects chef's tastes in cuisine

There's a certain blandness to dining at most restaurants.

Menus rarely change. Entrees and desserts are prepared the same way every time - with varying degrees of competency.

In short, it's dull.

Emily's, one of Northville's newest and finest establishments, breaks that mold. According to chef and owner Rick Halberg, variety is most definitely the spice of life.

"It would be pretty boring for me if we did the same things all the time," he said. "For customers, too."

You'll always find vegetarian, pasta, fish and even red meat dishes at Emily's. But selections from among those groups vary from week to week.

"The Northville population has been very receptive and very nice," Halberg said.

Emily's, located at 505 N. Center in downtown, opened last October. Formerly the Sheldon Road House, Halberg purchased the site from Tony Rizzo in August.

"I wanted to find a small venue like this," Halberg said. "It was perfect. It was really the kind of situation I was looking for, small, manageable and a decent physical plant."

The 45-year-old has been in the

business most of his life. He studied at the Culinary Institute in New York and worked at various establishments in the state and Michigan.

Halberg opened his own restaurant, R.I.K.'s, in West Bloomfield in the mid '80s. He closed the large Italian eatery last February and began looking at his current Northville location a few months later.

Coupled with the city's central location and good condition of the site, Halberg decided to go ahead with the project. Named for his daughter, Emily's serves up a slice of the Mediterranean to local patrons.

"I've always enjoyed the food from that region," Halberg said.

Emily's menu reflects his tastes.

Red Snapper in "Cartoccio" is an example. Florida red snapper fillets and herbed pasta are topped with a basque pipeerade, wrapped in parchment paper and baked.

"Something Fantastically Vegetarian" serves lighter palates. A

variety of stuffed and sauteed vegetables are served with a ricotta onion galette and roasted garlic-tomato sauce.

Entrees range from \$29 for the vegetarian creation to \$40 for Veal Chop with Truffles and Filet of Beef with Roquefort Bread Pudding. "First dishes" also vary each week, according to Halberg.

Last week's sampling included mushroom soup, gnocchi with chard and seafood strudel. Emily's Greens, fresh greens tossed with balsamic vinegar dressing, provides another fine starter.

No meal at Emily's is complete without a glass or bottle of wine.

From sparkling, such as Dom Perignon Brut Rose 1982, to red, Hermitage, Etienne Guigal, for example, an extensive wine list is offered. France, Italy, Spain, Germany and California are all represented. Patrons can pay anywhere from \$18 to over \$100 for a bottle.

# Anxious golfers go for it in Novi

## Novi, Michigan—

Tantalized by shots of Pebble Beach, Hawaii, Arizona and Palm Springs? Itching to grab one of those clubs shown endlessly in commercials and swung so smoothly by Fred Couples, Lanny Wadkins, Johnny Miller, even Kenny G for crying out loud? Sick of snow, ice and the wind chill factor?

Well, it's time to think green grass, blue skies and clubs that will cure even the ugliest swing. On second thought, maybe they won't cure the ugliest swing but golfers are dreamers and the time and place to think spring and swing is March 10-12 at the Novi Expo Center at Novi Road and I-96.

It's the third Southeast Michigan Golf Show and it's 30 percent larger than last year when it drew nearly 24,000 golfers. Show director Todd Smith said there will be 225 exhibitors.

"We have everything that's related to golf," Smith said. "It's a hands-on show. We've learned people want variety and they want to be able to get their hands on clubs, touch them, feel them, swing them. We have a hitting area where they'll be able to try out new clubs."

And, unlike some other consumer shows such as the North American

International Auto Show at Cobo Center, golfers can drive out with a new driver. They will be able to purchase items and take them with them, from clubs to clothes.

Leading retailers' Bavarian Village, Caddyshack, King Par, Nevada Bob and Pro Golf will be at the show as will specialty shops such as the DeWulf Golf Center which makes and repairs clubs.

"Almost everyone bought something last year," Smith said, "and they were paying with \$100 bills."

Smith said the show is split almost evenly between retailers, resorts, instruction/education and specialties.

"There are 10 hitting nets with free pro instruction, a seminar area with professionals, a nine hole putting green and sand trap with an instructor to show people how to get out of the sand.

"Quite a few of the local courses are going to hand out coupons for rounds of golf and we have large concession areas where the golfers can talk and eat," Smith said.

Admission is \$6; children 12 and under are free. Parking is \$4 and there are 3,000 paved parking places. Show hours are 4 to 9 p.m. Friday, March 10; 10 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. Saturday and 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Sunday.

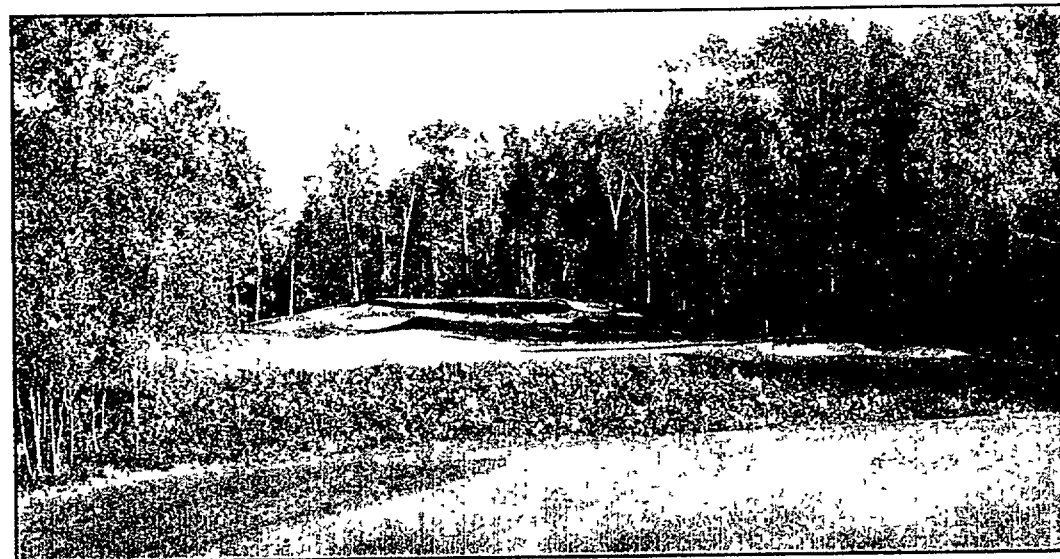

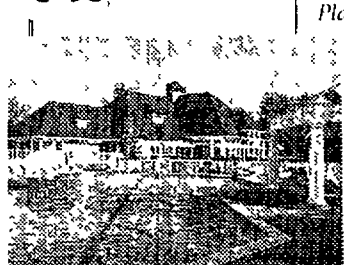

# Celebrate senior status!

Hope springs eternal and that old aphorism embodies golf, especially senior golf.

We're optimistic that the next swing will have the fluid grace of Tom Weiskopf and the unerring accuracy of Lee Trevino.

We're optimistic that this new graphite (or titanium or some other obscenely expensive material) shaft, connected to the latest and greatest football-sized head, will enable us to hit the ball as far as John Daly.

We're like Charlie Brown, running up to the football held by that doggone little Lucy. This time we're actually going to nail it. Then Lucy pulls the ball away. Again.

And so goes golf and it doesn't change when we hit 50, the qualifying age for the Senior PGA Tour and membership in the American Association of Retired Persons. Or 62 or 65, the Social Security entry levels.

But there are plenty of senior benefits in golf. Foremost is the Senior Tee. Call it gold, call it silver, call it red, just take advantage of it. That tee will give you instant length, something the latest titanium-graphite-super-duper drivers promise but never deliver. Don't be bashful. Proclaim your senior status and move up.

The new courses are the ones with the multiple tees, the tee to fit your game. For example, down at Disney World, there are four tees on the Osprey Ridge course designed by Tom Fazio. The colors are black, silver, gold and red.

There's a handicap figure on the scorecard behind each tee designation. It says "Recommended Tees." The figures are 0-6 for the black tees, 7-15 for the silver, 16-23 for the gold and 24 and up for the red. That takes out the guesswork for players unfamiliar with the course.

Michigan's resorts have gotten into multiple tees in a big way.

"Golf is supposed to be fun and it isn't fun if you're hitting nothing but wood clubs," said Treetops/Sylvan Resort Golf Director Rick Smith.

Smith has five and six tee pads on every hole on the Rick Smith Signature course at Treetops, a course that was selected as one of the top 10 new resort courses in the country by Golf Digest magazine. The tees are set each day depending on weather conditions.

Unfortunately some old courses usually have only blue (back) and white (middle) tees and then cut the grass lower in one fairway spot and put red tee markers there. Slowly, but surely, times are changing and the thrust is due to the new courses and designers attuned to the changes in the game and the growing number of senior golfers.

Proclaim your senior status to the cashier, too. Just as there are senior rates for haircuts, movies,

summer).

Golf course operators in the metropolitan area are looking for senior business. Seniors can play when traffic is light and seniors are a big share of the market. According to the most recent National Golf Foundation figures (1993-94), there are 2.7 million golfers aged 50 to 59 in the East North Central United States. That includes Michigan. From age 60-64 there are one million golfers and 65 and up an impressive 2.4 million.

Impressive too are the percentages that seniors represent.

gasoline and coffee to be found, almost every metropolitan-area course has senior rates that knock a few dollars off the greens fees. The usual restriction is that you tee off weekday mornings.

Seniors rates are more difficult to come by in the busy resort areas but Gaylord's Chamber of Commerce and Visitors Bureau sells an \$89 Passport which entitles anyone to pay for one person and cart and the second person plays and rides free. The Passport is good Sundays after 3 p.m. and all day Monday through Thursday.

Some of the state's leading courses and resorts honor the Passport including Fox Run at Grayling, Gaylord Country Club, Wilderness Valley (two courses), Hidden Valley, Treetops/Sylvan Resort (three courses), Garland Resort (three courses) with a fourth to open in mid-

The 50-59 age bracket represents 14.1 percent of all core golfers and the 65 and up bracket represents 15 percent of all core golfers.

Core golfers are those who play eight or more rounds annually. That's just a couple weeks of play for many seniors. Of golfers 50 and over, 35 percent fall into the "core" category.

A good place for seniors to do some greens fee pricing for the upcoming season is the Southeast Michigan Golf Show, March 10-12, at the Novi Expo Center. Many metropolitan courses and most of the northern Michigan resorts will be represented at the show.

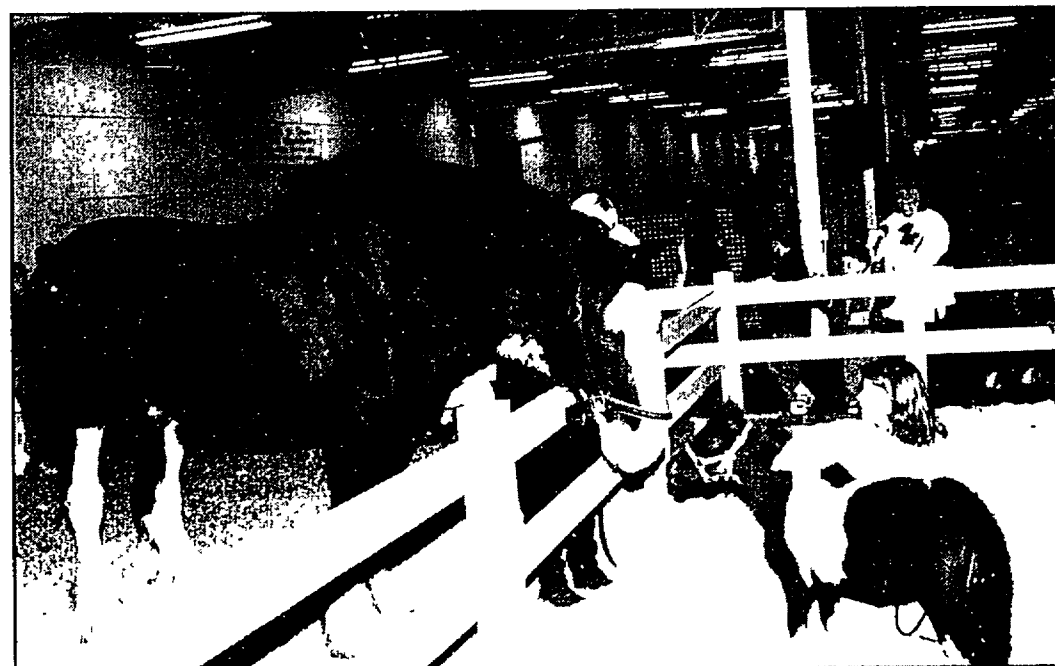

In the background we can hear sea sounds—the cry of gulls, the creak of rigging and the exciting swish of salt water rushing by.

Riley is team captain of the only all-woman crew in the 144-year history of the America's Cup, one of

yachting's most prestigious events. Her job is to make sure there's clear communication between afterguard decision makers, such as navigator and tactician, and the rest of the 16-member crew. She also gives strategic advice to the tactician and the helmswoman. "We stay away from the term 'skipper'" she says.

The 29 finalists (out of more than 650 applicants) who make up the *America3* team signed up for a painfully rigorous training program. "We do a lot of telephoning from the boat, because we don't have much time to talk to people when we're on shore," Riley explains into the phone. "This is one of our elimination series races. Today we're racing Dennis Connor. There are four rounds, and we alternate the three different boats. We keep racing each other, three times in each round. Before the semi-finals we'll have raced each other 12 times, refining our technique and teamwork."

At the moment the *America3* team is honing its skills using two obsolete boats dating back to earlier America's Cup competition. But a new space-age marvel is on the way and should be in their capable hands before the end of February.

Riley is one of four Michigan women on the *America3* team. She hails from Harrison Township, Merritt Palm from Grosse Pointe Park, and sisters Debbie and Katie Pettibone come from Port Huron. All are world class sailors.

*America3* is presently battling with two consortiums—Team Dennis Connor and Pact 95—for the honor of defending the America's Cup. The winner—the official Cup defender—will then race the winner among eight

challengers from half a dozen other countries.

They are presently battling amongst themselves for the honor of challenging the winning Cup defender in May. It's a long, tough struggle for everyone. And, in a sport where a mainsail alone costs \$45,000, many millions of dollars are involved.

The path to this pinnacle of sailing accomplishment is a rugged one. Before the eliminations started, a typical training day for the *America3* finalists began at the gym at 6:15 a.m. for two hours of physical and weight training. At 9, after a high carbohydrate breakfast, they attended a team meeting with the coaches and then prepared the boats for a day of sailing.

From 11:15 to 5 p.m. (with a half hour off for lunch) they were out at sea, practicing racing maneuvers. At 6 they cleaned and repaired the boat and at 7 were allowed to go home, unless there was a special occasion, such as a speaking or fundraising event.

They're a handsome, trim, healthy and clean-limbed group of young women, their raw physical strength concealed beneath their feminine skin. Dawn Riley is 5'6" tall and weighs 150 muscular pounds. Katie Pettibone, at 5'8", is 160 pounds. A normal American male would be ill-advised to pick a fight with anybody in the *America3* crew.

Merritt Palm grew up with a sailing family in the Detroit area. Her parents, Ed and Pat Palm, were volunteer directors of the junior sailing program at Grosse Pointe Yacht Club, and Merritt and her brother Justin spent years there, five of them being coached by Derrick

Merritt sailed her first Port Huron-to-Mackinac race at 15. She's a veteran of many races, including the Adams Cup in 1988. She is currently ranked among the 10 top U.S. sailors in the European dinghy class.

Says Justin Palm, "Sailing, for our family, has always been there. Starting when I was about eight, every year the whole family would cruise

6, and Dawn was maybe 10."

Todd, who has sailed in 10 Port Huron to Mackinac races, is now account executive on Cadillac Motors at D'Arcy Masius Benton & Bowles in Bloomfield Hills. "Our family went boating on so many weekends that it frustrated Dawn because she wanted to enter sailing competitions."

Sometimes, when the children were younger, the Riley family would sail to places like Bayfield (a lovely town on the Canadian shore of Lake Huron) and live on the boat with their mother in summer while their father would commute on weekends. This, says Todd, was why he and Dawn often couldn't get into junior sailing programs at local clubs.

The Rileys took their 38-foot wooden sailboat on a year-long cruise to the Caribbean and back, when Dawn was in the eighth grade. All three children hit the books on long sails so they could keep up their school work.

Dawn and Todd were both members of the Michigan State University sailing team. They sailed Flying Juniors on Lake Lansing and traveled weekends to compete in races elsewhere.

Dawn is engaged (remember you read it here) to Barry McKay of New Zealand, whom she met while on the

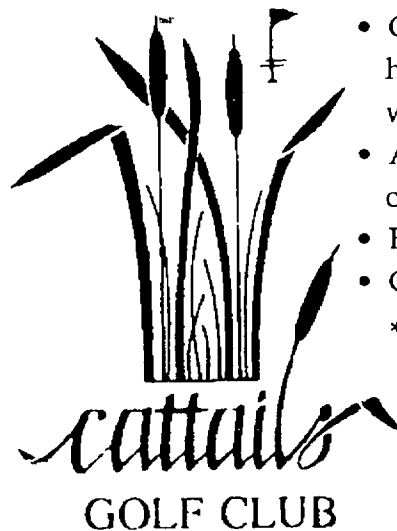
"They're all good sailors. What has sex got to do with it?"

Adds Justin Palm, "Those girls have the best coach out there, and the best organization. They will also have a faster boat when it arrives this month. Add the enthusiasm these women have, and I think it gives them an edge."

Says Dawn Riley, "We're the only ones with an old boat. The new one should be a lot faster. When you consider how well we've done so far, I think our prospects are good."

the North Channel."

"Merritt was 25 when she was chosen for the *America3* crew," says Justin, who until recently coached the junior sailing program at Bayview.

"I was very happy for her. America's Cup is something every sailor sees as a premiere sailing event. I'm proud of her, and a little jealous."

Dawn Riley has an even more impressive resume. At 30 she has twice sailed the grueling Whitbread Round-the-World Race, each on an all-woman crew. In 1989-90 she was watch captain on *Maiden*, and in 1993-94 skipper of *Heineken*. In 1992 she crewed aboard *America3* for the America's Cup defender trials, took first place in the Santa Maria Cup in Baltimore, and in the Woman's Cup in Portofino, Italy.

"Dawn was always the aggressive one," recalls her brother Todd Riley. "She always wanted to go out and do whatever the boys did. Especially sailing, she's been in that forever. Our parents used to put us in sailing dinghies tied to a long rope and let us sail away from our parents' boat until we reached the end of the rope. I remember doing that when I was 5 or

Whitbread.

All the women in the Pettibone family are expert Great Lakes sailors (Debbie learned nautical knots from her grandmother, who is still an active sailor at 70). Both sisters have long experience in major regattas.

Not many women attain such rarefied heights of sailing competition as Dawn Riley, Merritt Palm or the Pettibone sisters. "However," says Sandy Thompson, a dedicated racing sailor from Harper Woods, "we see a lot more women on the race courses these days as skippers and as boat owners. It's a fun sport and women are pursuing it more. A lot of them got started through junior programs in the yacht clubs. And they're at all different levels of skill, just like the men."

A lot of Americans, including sailors and landlubbers of both sexes, are rooting for the *America3* team.

Sandy Thompson once teamed up with Dawn Riley in an Adams Cup elimination, a double-handed competition for women sponsored by the United States Sailing Association. "Dawn's a very competitive and accomplished sailor," she says.

One of the giants of twentieth century art, Picasso, is featured in a special exhibition through March 19.

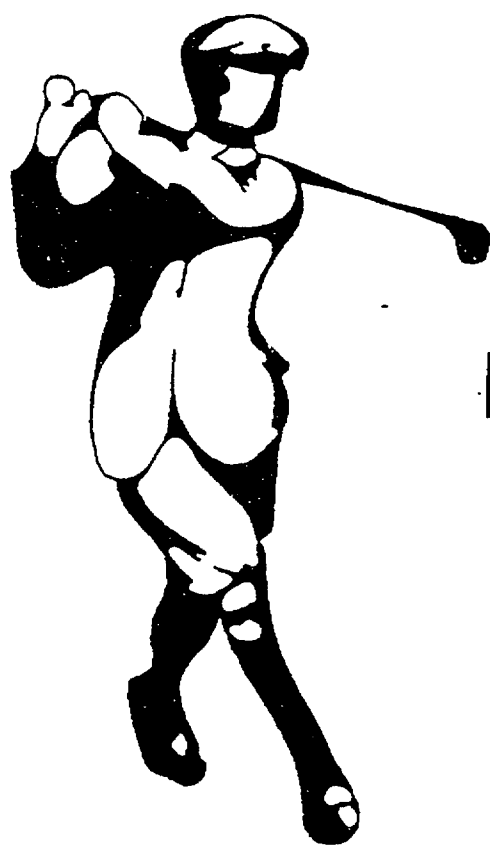

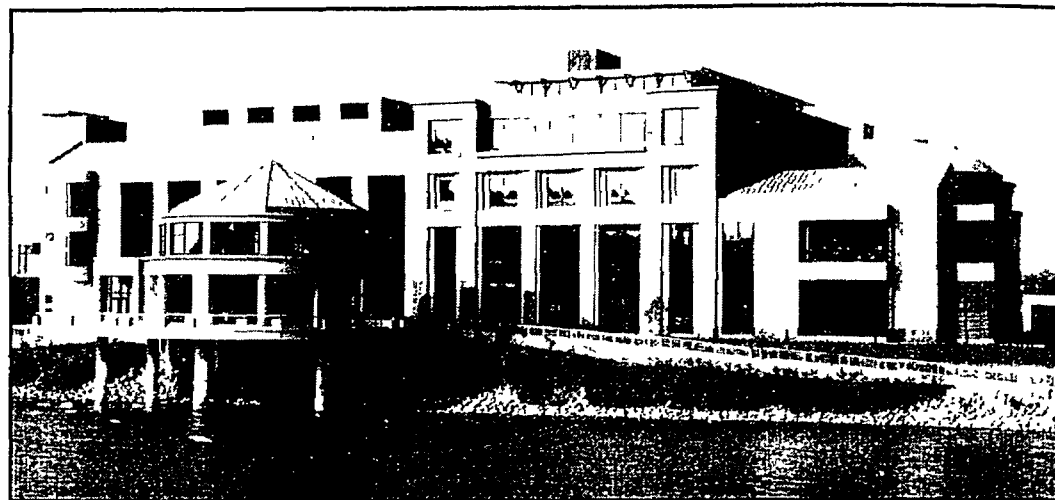

Preliminary planning that began 16 years ago, resulted in the opening last November of the Van Andel Museum Center of the Public Museum of Grand Rapids on the riverfront in downtown Grand Rapids. It immediately drew crowds and applause as a "new world class museum."

The \$39 million center features as its biggest exhibition, *The Furniture City*, telling the story of how furniture manufacturing affected the people and shaped the growth of the community from 1840 to the present.

But the museum is much more than a history of the city's major industry. It's a three-level adventure for visitors, whether they be school children, history buffs or sky watchers.

All ages flock to the operating Spillman carousel in its glass-enclosed pavilion extending over the Grand River. When we first visited the museum on a December Sunday, it

was children who were thrilled to ride the restored lion, giraffe, deer, goat, tiger, camel, chariots and 44 hand-carved, jeweled horses. On a Thursday in January, we found senior citizens paying their 50 cents to climb on board for a nostalgic ride to the music of a Wurlitzer band organ.

Barbara Kravitz, assistant public relations officer in charge of media relations, explained as she led us on a tour of the museum that a community campaign was launched in 1981 to acquire the carousel after the loss of a beloved carousel at East Grand Rapids Ramona Park.

One of only three carousels of its style manufactured by the Spillman Engineering Company of New York in 1928, it operated in Barnesville, Pennsylvania, from 1928 until 1981. Kravitz explained that approximately 300 hours of work went into the restoration of each animal to bring them back to their original color and design. John and Linda Layton of New Castle, Pennsylvania, were

another \$3 million endowment. Other major corporate gifts have come from Meijer for whom the museum theater is named and Steelcase.

As Kravitz led the way through the exhibits, it was apparent that efforts had been made to preserve the history of Grand Rapids for a long time. As visitors step from the main lobby into the galleria, they walk on tile preserved from the old city hall dating to 1888. French nymph statues, also from the city hall, have been restored and placed at the galleria entrance.

Overhead, a 76-foot finback whale, one of the world's largest whale skeletons, is suspended. It had been in the museum's collection since 1906 when a Michigan resident found it beached in Florida and sent it to the museum but was just restored. "The public hasn't seen it in a long time", Kravitz noted.

As we strolled along the galleria we enjoyed spectacular views through floor-to-ceiling glass walls of the river

commissioned by the museum to do the work.

Donations came from children to senior citizens, Kravitz said.

In fact, the entire project of building a museum to house its humanities and natural history exhibits has been a community effort, Kravitz said, explaining that the new facility replaces a much smaller building across the river. The museum itself is now 141 years old.

The first floor of the three-story galleria bears plaques containing names of 24,000 donors.

The center is named for Jay and Betty Van Andel, principal patrons whose wealth comes from Amway. They donated \$3 million as the planning began and also have given

and downtown. On our right we entered *Grand Rapids 1890s*, a recreation of the city at the turn of the century which begins with a replica of the old Union Depot waiting room and continues through a street of seven shops including one displaying Bissell carpet sweepers which were made in Grand Rapids. Kravitz observed that the museum had been given a collection of 2,000 sweepers.

A wide staircase takes visitors to the second floor for an up-close inspection of a 35-ton 1905 Corliss-type steam engine with an 18-foot flywheel powering a partially operational re-construction of an early 20th century furniture factory.

More than 120 pieces of Grand Rapids-made furniture from the

museum's collection are on display. Kravitz noted that the collection is the third largest in the country, following closely behind that at Winterthur.

Displays that are sound-activated as visitors approach explain how immigrants, many from the Netherlands, created furniture for the masses in

the Grand Rapids factories. On display is an award-winning bedroom suite from the centennial of 1876 that "put Grand Rapids on the map."

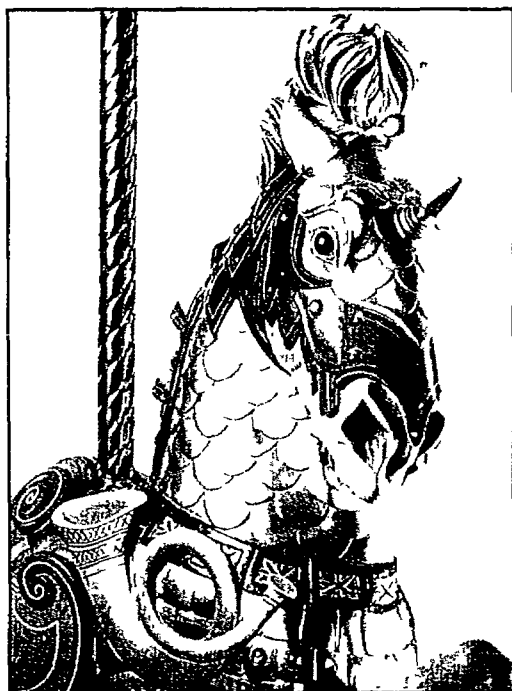
There's also a Frank Lloyd Wright-designed desk and chair made by the Metal Office Furniture Company, which became Steelcase. That company donated \$1 million for the museum.

"We (Grand Rapids), considered ourselves the Paris of furniture design in the 1920s," Kravitz related, noting that furniture marts were held in the city regularly. Area displays show advertising and souvenirs of the era.

At the end of the second floor galleria is the Roger B. Chaffee planetarium. *Skydance*, a 15-minute presentation in light and sound, was designed to showcase the capabilities of the planetarium's \$1,000,000 system for the opening and runs through February. "State-of-the-art laser, video and audio technology bring stars within your reach," the staff noted.

*Cosmic Perceptions* will open in March.

Ascending to the third level,

visitors see close up the clock that originally was in the old city hall tower.

"It has a smaller bell installed when we sent it to Maine for restoration in order not to blow us out of here when it chimes," said Kravitz.

In the third floor natural history galleries, full-scale dioramas show Michigan plants and animals in their natural settings. These already have been visited by school groups, Kravitz noted, pointing out floor-level windows for the smallest viewers. Worth watching is a video giving a

bird's perspective while flying over the landscape from Grand Rapids to Lake Michigan.

*Anishinabek: The People of this Place*, to tell the story of the Native Americans of West Michigan, is scheduled to open as a permanent exhibit in June. Kravitz emphasized that the "exciting part of this is that the exhibit will be a collaborative effort between the Anishinabe community and the museum and will reflect Anishinabe views."

The third level also contains a gallery for changing exhibitions. It is to open with an exhibit from the Smithsonian.

Barbara Kravitz pointed out that the museum center is available after closing hours to convention visitors, community groups and others for dinners, receptions and meetings for up to 2,000 people and has a first-floor catering kitchen for this purpose. She mentioned that the museum expects to raise additional funding from this source.

For museum visitors a second floor cafe features fresh breads, an espresso bar, salads, soups, sandwiches and desserts. We enjoyed a tasty pumpkin nut roll with raspberry coffee.

Also popular is the Curiosity Shop at the museum entrance featuring books and gifts for children and adults. A popular purchase at Christmas was the first Christmas ornament of a carousel horse. There

even is a book, *Eliza's Carousel Lion*, written by Lynn Strough for children.

The Van Andel Museum Center, principal facility of the Public Museum of Grand Rapids, is located on the site of the old Voight Crescent Flour Mill on the west bank of the Grand River, adjacent to the Gerald R. Ford Museum at 272 Pearl St. N. W.

It may be reached from I-196 West Ottawa Ave./Downtown Exit 77C. From US-131 use Pearl St. Exit 85B. From I-96 East use Lake Michigan Dr. Exit 75 east.

The museum is open daily from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Parking is available adjacent to the museum (which does have a barrier-free elevator).

Museum admission is \$5 for adults, \$4 for seniors 62 and older, \$2 for children 3-17, under 3 are free. A special rate is available for groups of more than 20. Planetarium shows are \$1.50 additional during the day and \$5 for laser shows. For additional information, group tours or evening rentals call 616-456-3977.
