

Psychiatric hospital eyed for closure

Plans are in the works to close Northville Regional Psychiatric Hospital but they won't come to fruition for a few years yet.

The hospital, located on Seven Mile Road in Northville Township, is one of the biggest and oldest facilities of its kind in Michigan. It had more than 1,200 patients at its peak but has steadily declined in population over the years and now houses about 450 residents.

The downward slide has led state officials to talk about closing the hospital. State Sen. Bob Geake, R-Northville, said, but just

Immediate closing is unlikely, but the institution could become a budget casualty in a few years.

when that will happen hasn't yet been decided yet.

"Closing it has been part of our thinking for some years," Geake said, "but I've heard no talk of closing it in the immediate future."

Plan envisions baseball, soccer at Ford park

Think of the heart of the Northville community and immediately the words "Main Street" come to mind.

The Northville Parks and Recreation Commission has devised a master plan for Ford Park on South Main Street that could reinforce the downtown area as the epicenter of activity for the community.

The master plan, approved by the city planning commission Tuesday night, proposes to construct new soccer and baseball fields at Ford field, and add playground equipment, fishing docks and pedestrian walking/bike trails through the park, which winds around the former Ford Valve Plant and continues west of Griswold Street up to Ford Field.

'Please don't feed the animals' to become new Northville motto

The Northville City Council passed a resolution Monday night saying that feeding waterfowl at Ford Pond Park is for the birds.

Or more literally, not for the birds at all.

The council resolution states that the longtime tradition of feeding the ducks and geese that make their home near the former Ford

Valve Plant represents a health risk for the wildlife and should be discouraged.

"We want people to enjoy the geese and ducks, but they just can't feed them," said Traci Johnson, director of the parks and recreation department. "I think people will understand, I really do."

The resolution is not an official ordinance and does not carry

penalties or fines if park visitors are found feeding the birds. However, the city strongly advises against feeding due to identified health risks to the birds and the surrounding area.

Consultation with officials from the Department of Natural Resources and the Wayne County Health Department has revealed that bird feeding is causing an

Police say track expansion could force costly staff hires

If Northville Downs is given the green light from the state Legislature to expand its operation into an all-day, year-round establishment, the city could see its public safety costs increase by more than \$500,000 dollars annually, a report released Monday by the police department stated.

Although city officials are still

speculating on the effects of the proposed race track bill - which among other things would allow tracks to be open from 10-2 a.m. year-round - the department's report gives administrators a clearer picture of the police power that would be needed to handle the expanded hours of operation.

Currently Northville Downs is open from mid-October to the beginning of April during the

evening - half of what the pending bill has proposed.

"A lot of this is still speculation because we don't have the hard, hard figures," Chief Rodney Cannon said. "But it does give us a foundation."

The proposed legislation - which would also allow for electronic gaming machines on-site, telephone betting and inter-track and

Ward church plan dissected

The Northville Township Planning Commission put the controversial Ward Church plan under the microscope again this week, but held off on a decision about it pending more information.

Members of the commission spent three hours Tuesday night doggedly plowing through a four-

page list of concerns about the much-ballyhooed proposal. When the mini-marathon was over they sent the project's backers on their way with a laundry list of requests for even more details.

Both sides will tackle them at the commission's next meeting on June 27.

Ward, now located at Six Mile and Farmington roads in Livonia,

wants to build a new and bigger church on 140 acres it owns at Six Mile and Haggerty Roads. Church representatives have offered two different development proposals.

The one that fits the land's current zoning combines the church with a subdivision and a set of office buildings. The one Ward officials prefer - and many township

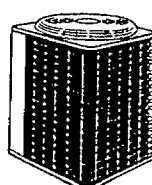

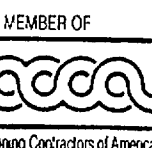

Ugly prank disgusts high school officials

Bridge over Eight Mile defaced

Four dead animals were found embedded in a large pool of tar last Thursday on the pedestrian bridge connecting Northville High School with the athletic fields on the other side of Eight Mile, the result of an apparent senior prank that school officials are calling "despicable."

Principal Tom Johnson said he is "furious" over the episode and plans to take swift action against the people involved once they are found.

"I have a problem with pranks, but the dead animals - it was an intolerable, inexcusable act," Johnson said.

A couple walking their dog early Thursday morning were the first to come across the scene. Three dead squirrels - which a police report said appeared to have been killed shortly before being placed in the tar - and a fourth unidentifiable animal - which apparently died when it was struck on the road - were found near the north-side entrance of the bridge.

The bridge had been vandalized, with the words "Seniors" and "Smell this" with an arrow pointing to the animals applied to the concrete in black spray paint.

Two names were also spray painted onto the bridge, a lead Northville City Police are looking into.

Johnson said it cost the district \$227 to clean up the area.

Police found the cover of what appeared to be a five-gallon bucket near the scene and lifted several fingerprints after dusting the evidence.

Three five-gallon buckets and the cap of a spray-paint can were also found near Cooke Middle School north of the overpass.

A DeWitt's liquid roof coating bucket, believed to be the container of the tar, a Wind Fresh 40-pound laundry detergent bucket and a white plastic construction paint bucket were also found by police.

Sergeant Dave Fendelet urges residents who might be missing any of these items from their homes or have any other information that may be helpful in the

case to contact Northville City Police at 349-1234.

"We can use all the help we can get," Fendelet said.

Johnson was so distressed by the act - apparently a prank by graduating seniors - that he has offered a \$100 reward to any student supplying information leading to the prosecution of those involved.

Northville City Police plan to recommend charges of animal cruelty and vandalism once the suspects are found, Fendelet said.

Animal cruelty carries a penalty of 90 days in jail and/or a \$500 fine. Vandalism presents the same consequences with an additional option of restitution.

This is the second year in a row that the high school has fallen prey to senior pranks.

The high school building suffered about \$8,500 in damage last year after almost every exterior

wall was vandalized with such words as "Smoke" and "Seniors" written in paint.

The two students involved - both graduating seniors - were prosecuted and diverted into a program for youthful offenders.

This year's prank and last year's vandalism were unfortunate exceptions in what were otherwise quiet school year closings, Johnson said.

"There hasn't been that many problems before last year," he said. "We have had some excellent school closings in the past."

Johnson said he plans to beef up security on school grounds over the next couple of weeks leading up to the last day of classes, June 15.

Midnight custodial staff will keep an eye on the school grounds more closely and city police will make more frequent patrols up to the hill, Johnson said.

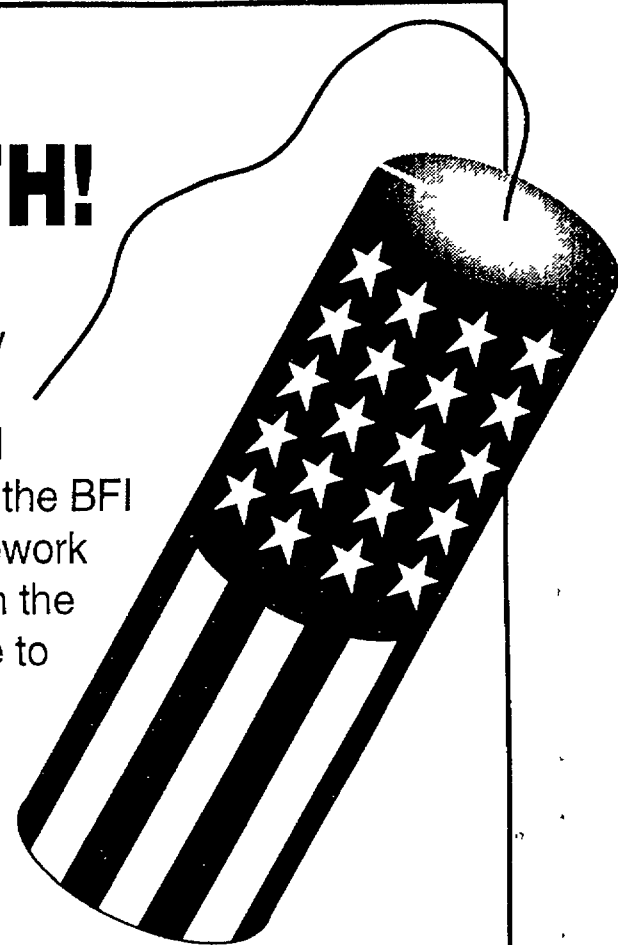

Hearing delayed on township's lawsuit over state double bunking

Northville Township's court battle over prison double bunking will idle in neutral for another two weeks.

A May 26 hearing in Wayne County Circuit Court on the township's request for a contempt of court order against the state Department of Corrections (DOC) was canceled, attorney Jim Tamm said this week. The hearing was rescheduled to June 23, he added,

because the lawyer representing the DOC was unable to attend due to illness.

The township took the state to court because the DOC began double-bunking prisoners at the Western Wayne Correctional Facility, located on Five Mile Road in Plymouth Township. Tamm asked a Circuit Court judge to hold the DOC in contempt for that action, claiming it violated a 1990 court order.

That order required the DOC to enforce a state law passed in 1986 which among other things capped the prison's inmate population at 500.

Representatives of the state Attorney General's office, however, say that the court order is no longer legally valid because Gov. John Engler and the state legislature passed a law in April that increased the Western Wayne cap to 775 inmates.

Object tossed from Eight Mile bridge hits car

A 44-year-old Northville man's car suffered approximately \$500 in damage when an unknown object thrown from the pedestrian bridge over Eight Mile Road at the high school struck his windshield.

The object cracked the windshield and then scratched the side of the car when he was driving east on Eight Mile June 4. Northville City Police found no evidence of what the object was or who might have thrown it.

Activist mounts last-minute bid as write-in school board candidate

One Northville parent is mounting an 11th-hour attempt to make waves in what is otherwise a sleeper of a school board election with three uncontested bids for the Northville Board of Education.

Annette Minard, 45, a parent of two sons at Northville High School, decided last weekend to run a write-in campaign for one of the two four-year terms open on the school board.

"It wasn't a real election without a choice," said Minard, adding that a number of parents approached her last week urging her to enter the race. "I simply didn't know there were parents that were willing to support a candidacy."

Minard is hoping to score an upset victory over one of the two incumbents — President Bob McMahon and Vice President Richard Brown — running for new four-year terms. Trustee Barb Bennett is running for the one year remaining in former Secretary Pat Custer's term. Bennett was appointed to the position earlier

this year when Custer resigned.

Current school board terms expire June 30. Voters go to the polls to elect trustees next Monday, June 12.

"I realize I'm up against some heavy weights," Minard said. "But choice is a real issue and I hope what I have to offer voters will stand on its own."

A payroll and finance administrator for Yee/Minard & Associates, Minard has a lengthy record of involvement in the district: She was a member of the Strategic Planning committee in 1993, a member of the Stakeholders High School Day Evaluation Committee last year and has been active with the Legislative Action Network for the past two years.

Minard was also the Parent/Teacher Association Council representative to the statewide Coalition of Michigan Parents last year, attended the Atlanta Model Schools Conference with other Northville teachers, administrators and parents last June and is an active member of the high school's Parent/Teach-

er/Student Association.

Although much of her support comes from the high school, Minard says she is not a single-issue candidate and has a firm commitment to the district as a whole.

Among the more pressing issues facing the district, keeping on top of state mandates and financial issues is of "grave concern" to her.

"The state funding situation is primarily pressing because it is out of our control," she said. "It's legislative quicksand at the state level."

Come July 10 board members will face the weighty decision of whether to bring a \$53.9 million bond issue and/or an enhancement millage request — with a maximum of 3 mills for two years (\$2.7 million each year) — to voters in the next school year. Also included in board recommendations is \$7 million in technology upgrades divided among proposed bond and millage issues.

Although she supports bringing such issues to voters, Minard said the district must also focus on cre-

ating a cohesive vision for the district in terms of curriculum, programs and teaching.

"They are honest and thoughtful, but fragmented attempts," said Minard of the district's citizen committees for bond, enhancement and technology. "The board has a big responsibility. They can't go for an election with three separate campaigns. They need to show voters there is a clear vision and goal. It's going to be a hard sell."

Minard is also particularly interested in how negotiations for the district's restructured high school day will pan out.

Currently the Northville Education Association and administrators are discussing the fate of the one-year pilot program where teachers meet for collegial planning sessions each Wednesday morning and students start classes three hours later than usual.

"I have been a staunch supporter of teacher-inspired change," she said. "But I am also a vocal opponent of taking away student time."

Minard hopes that positive

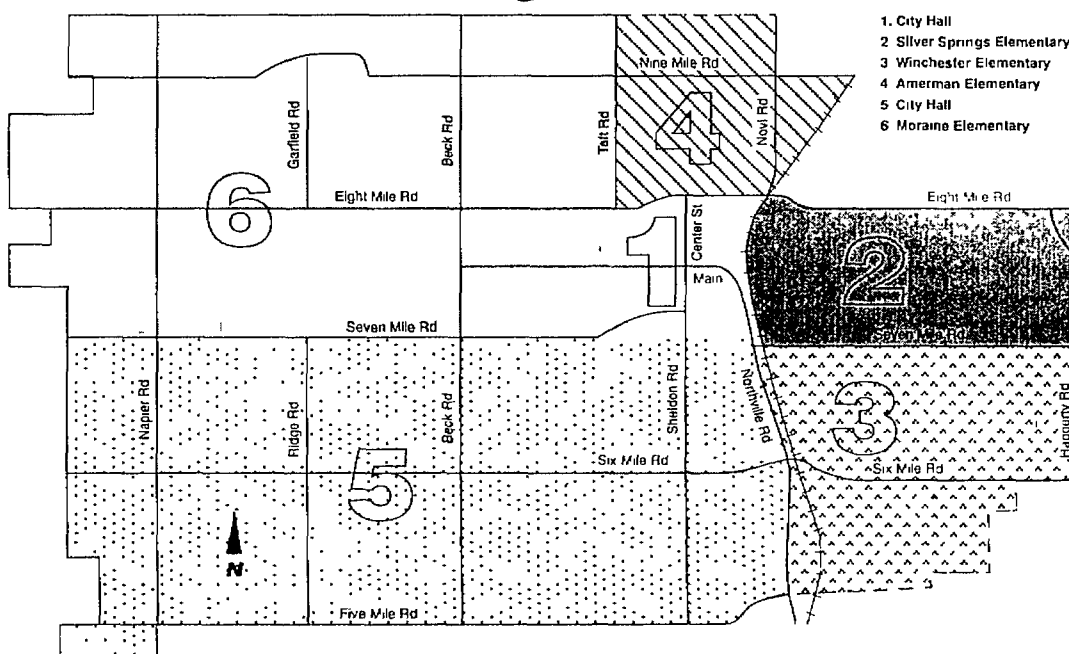

In the Schoolcraft election, newcomer Brian Broderick will attempt to oust one of the three incumbents for one of their six-

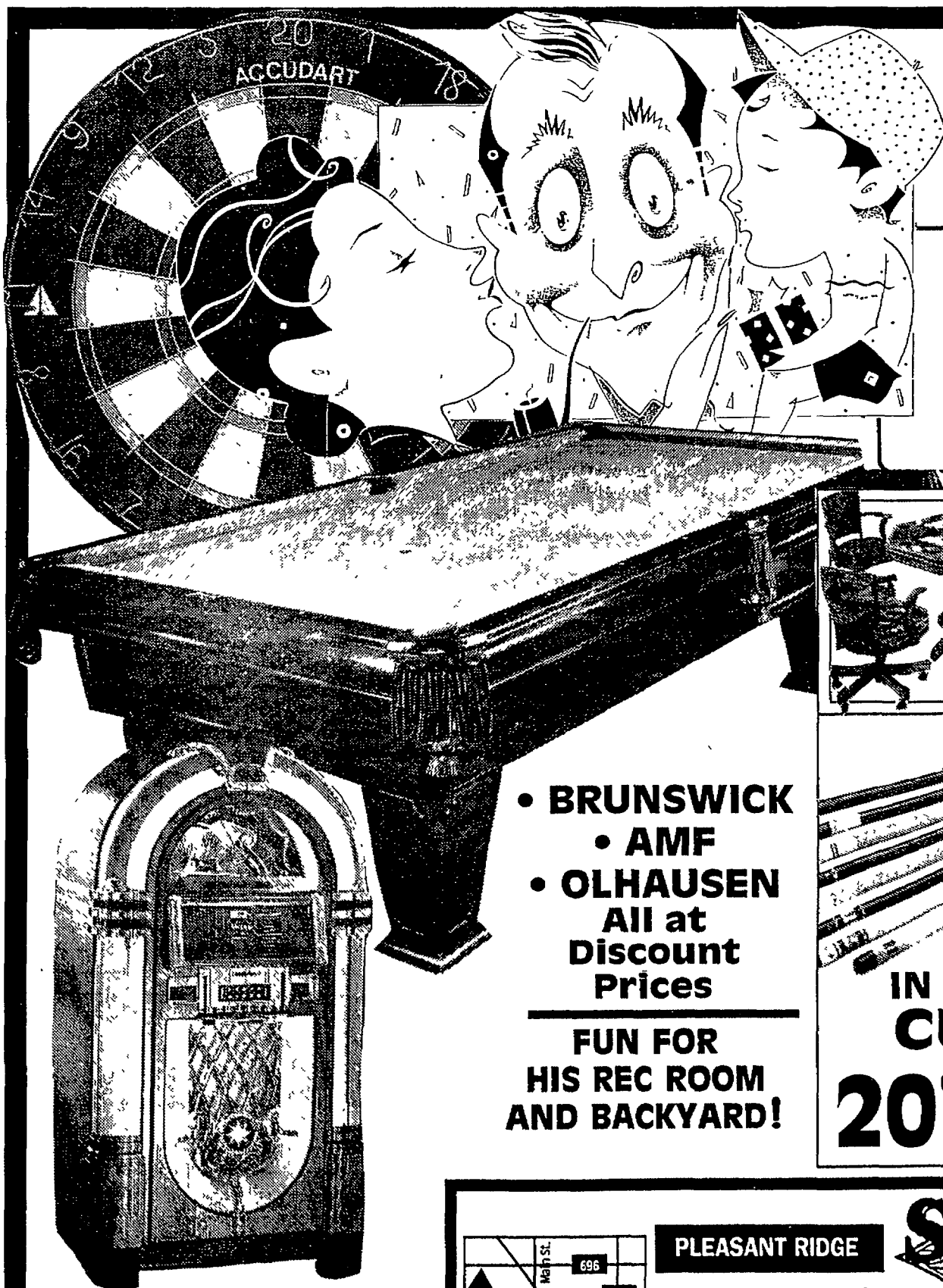

Most Pressing Problem

In your opinion, what is the single most pressing issue facing the school district and how do you propose to deal with it?

The most pressing issue facing this district will be how to continue providing quality education in a period of uncertainty.

The school finance reforms enacted in 1994 through Proposal A and related legislation dramatically shifted control of public education to the state. At this time 90 percent of the money spent on education in Northville is paid from the state treasury. State control of school funding gives state government greater control of school operations.

Experience has shown the legislative agenda for education tends to be unstable. If requirements change each year when the Legislature reconvenes or every time a different legislator is appointed to chair the education committee, school districts will find it difficult to conduct a coherent educational program.

Although several pressing matters confronted the District this year, I think the passage of Proposal A is the most significant. The District moved from one that essentially was supported by local taxpayer dollars to one that is totally dependent on the state for revenue. This major shift from local to state revenue places school funding beyond local control.

There also are rumblings now from Lansing that the foundation grant for the 1995-96 school year will be reduced. This impact, along with the potential cut in the June payment from the state requires the District to be fiscally frugal in the coming years.

Careful review of requests for additional funding and review of present expenditures are necessary. If the district is affected by state cuts, we must be prudent, understanding that student learning is the priority.

With the District almost totally dependent on the state for funding, the possibility of cuts in revenue is a major concern.

I believe we must immediately begin planning "fall back" budget cuts which have the least impact on student learning. We should conduct a zero-based budget review, evaluating each program and its contribution toward meeting the district's core mission, K-12 education.

An issue more directly under the district's control is how to best deal with the continuing growth in student enrollment. Our enrollment has increased 20 percent in the last six years, and is projected to grow an additional 24 percent over the next six. To keep growth from negatively affecting our program we must provide the necessary capacity in a cost effective manner.

High School Wednesday

The district's pilot program enabling teachers at the high school to hold study session meetings Wednesday mornings comes up for review. The conferences delay the start of school that day till 10:40 a.m. Do you favor continuing the program into next year?

The Wednesday mornings provided an opportunity for the staff of Northville High School to meet and discuss issues that will make a difference at the school.

The Board will be receiving a report from the Steering Committee soon and will request input from the administration. The need for collegial planning time at the high school needs to be addressed - it has made a difference at the elementary and the middle school level.

In April we received an evaluation report on the School Day Concept that was very positive. Faculty, parents and administrators believe that the high school needs change in order to support the creativity of the faculty and enhance student learning.

The desire for change and the commitment of all parties are strong enough to work collaboratively to prepare our students for the next century.

Without a doubt, the restructured high school day was the most visible issue during the 1994-95 year.

From the student perspective, there seems to be immediate positive results - higher attendance on Wednesday than any other day of the week and participation in beneficial morning programs. At least one student survey strongly endorsed the restructured day.

The collegial planning aspects of the high school day were positive for the staff. Sharing information and knowledge with colleagues and learning new skills, technology and methodologies also were important to faculty members.

Progress can't be made without change and some risk taking. We need to develop a clear vision as to the future direction of the high school.

The High School Day Steering Committee and staff have put a great deal of effort into the program, and many interesting ideas and improvements for the high school have come out of this year's study sessions. However, improvement is an ongoing process that must occur concurrently with our best efforts at educating today's students.

As I stated during last year's school board campaign, I believe that we should be increasing class time for students, not reducing it. We should get back to a full class schedule as soon as possible, and then start exploring the most effective way to add additional class time.

High School Learning Environment

The idea for the restructured school day came, in part, from the perception that the high school suffers from a stagnant learning environment. Do you agree with this perception?

No. The problems facing the high school are similar to those that face all high schools. High schools are large and impersonal and classes can be boring, dominated by teacher talk. High schools do not always meet the needs of a diverse student body, making some students feel like forgotten parts of the system. Problems exist, but so do solutions.

The solutions fall under four areas: curriculum and teaching, school organization, community outreach, and technology. The restructured day was an attempt by the Board to provide time within the school week so that the staff of the high school could address those areas.

The high school day evolved as a result of the Strategic Plan and its vision for student learning. The high school was one of several areas that was explored for possible change.

From the initiation of Strategic Planning in September 1989, the high school has maintained and improved its academic excellence. MEAP scores are some of the highest in the state; students continue to receive national recognition as merit scholars; over 90 percent attend college upon graduation; drop out rates are less than 1 percent; AP courses were developed in several disciplines; the high school received and maintained its national accreditation, an honor earned by few high schools.

The restructured high school day is a logical step in the progression of change.

For Northville High School to move into the 21st century we - parents, school board, administration, staff and students - must have a clear, common understanding of our objectives.

Rather than focus on "change," we must instead become committed to improvement, identifying how we can become one of the best high schools in the country, challenging students to reach their full potential. We don't need to reinvent the wheel in Northville, we can look at the most successful programs, public or private, and learn from them.

A focus on achieving common objectives will pull together the community. While we need the participation of all major stakeholders for success, I believe the school board has a critical leadership role to play in this process.

Substance Abuse

Surveys at the high school indicate a high level of substance abuse among students there. What do you think should be done about this?

In January 1995, the Board received a report from the AOD/Health Task Force which included short and long term recommendations as well as areas for further study. All of the short term recommendations have been assigned to an administrator and the Board will receive a report from the administration on June 26.

On May 17, the report of the Zero Tolerance for Youth Substance Abuse Task Force was released. Its recommendations are comprehensive, well thought out, and provide a road map for addressing the substance abuse problem in the community.

As stated in the report, "It is the intention of the Northville Public Schools to do everything we can to consistently discourage substance abuse among our students."

Drug and alcohol abuse are everyone's concern. The schools are only one party in this equation. It takes the community, working cooperatively, to solve the problem.

The AOD Community Task Force made several short and long term recommendations to the District for consideration. These recommendations included increased parent education, especially for parents of 8th-10th grade students; AOD training for staff; expanded conflict resolution training in the schools; greater use of high school students to help teach drug resistance in the elementary and middle schools.

As a Board member, I will do my part to ensure the district supports efforts to decrease student drug and alcohol use. I ask the community to attend the school board meeting June 26, when AOD recommendations will be presented.

Northville has a seriously high level of alcohol and drug use among our young people and the community must face this problem and deal with it.

Many groups in Northville are working toward a "Zero Tolerance" community. The schools, of course, play a major role in this effort. We must work together to send a clear message that this community will not tolerate youth substance abuse.

The District formed an Alcohol and Other Drugs (AOD) and Health Task Force last October to study the school district's role in dealing with this serious problem. The committee's recommendations should be carried out. We must have clear rules, consistently enforced. We must show that there are serious consequences to substance abuse, as well as teaching why and how to resist drugs.

Technology Bonds

An advisory committee has recommended placing a \$7 bond request before voters to finance far-reaching technology improvements in the district. Will you vote to put this issue on the ballot?

The Board received the Bond Committee Report on May 22 and the Enhancement Committee Report is scheduled for June 26. Then, after review and analysis, recommendations for action will be presented at the July 10 Board of Education meeting.

The recommendations of the Technology Committee have been integrated into the reports of the two committees. After reviewing the information gathered by the committees to support their recommendations, I would think that the community will respond favorably to the recommendations.

I will vote to place the request before the voters. The Board is appreciative of the commitment and dedication of the staff and the members of the community that served on those committees.

The district made a wise decision in 1989 when it used bond funds to lay the foundation of its present computer network that allowed for connectivity within and between all schools. The Information Age, however, is here and constantly evolving to higher levels. The district must keep pace with change.

Many existing computers are outdated and cannot run new software. The most important aspect of the new technology is its integration into the curriculum and classroom lesson plans. This commitment needs to become a priority item.

Requests for technology funds would be divided between a bond issue and an enhancement millage. The Enhancement Committee won't be making its report to the Board until June 26, and the Board will decide in July whether to endorse those recommendations.

The Citizen/Staff Technology Committee report is far-reaching and involves the community as well as the school district. It calls for expenditures on state-of-the-art hardware and software, as well as increased training and support staff. It recommends providing computer services and training to the community at large.

Many of the projects recommended in the report raise significant policy issues. Before we ask voters for technology funding, we must understand how it will be used, whether these projects lie within the mission of the district and what the costs will be.

The initial cost of the technology plan would be provided through millage requests (bond and enhancement). We must make sure that future costs for technology staffing, training, maintenance, and hardware upgrades can be contained within the budget.

New Millage?

How do you feel about asking voters to approve additional millage for the district?

The Board will be receiving the Enhancement Millage Report on June 26. Local school districts are allowed to ask residents for additional millage only for three years, for a maximum of three mills per year.

Northville now has only two more years in which to approach the voters for a request for enhancement millage. After that the Wayne County Regional Service Agency will be able to go for the millage. If the committee recommends that the School Board approach the voters for such a millage, this will be an opportunity for the district to increase the local share of school finance - that is, Northville money staying in Northville. I would vote to place such a request on the ballot for the consideration of the voters.

The Board accepted the initial Enhancement Committee's report in August 1994 not to proceed with a millage vote in the fall of 1994.

An important factor to remember is that any funds generated by an enhancement millage would be controlled by the Northville school district, not Lansing. Another factor is that enhancement millage must be used for specific aspects of education, not for infrastructure repairs or buildings.

The Enhancement Millage Committee report will be presented at the June 26 Board meeting. Before any decisions are made, the Board needs to review the reports from both the Bond and Enhancement Committees before placing language on the ballot.

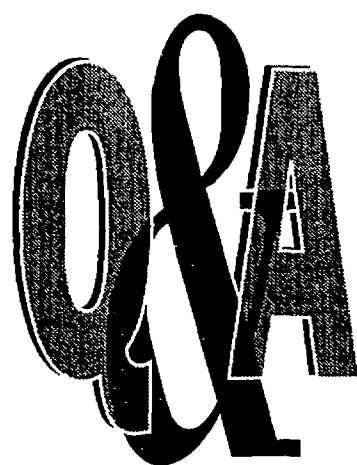
Northville is a growing district and under the new per-pupil funding mechanism our revenues will increase as our enrollment grows.

We must focus on managing our costs, prioritizing our resources where they will best improve student learning. If we still need additional funds to run the district, we must communicate that need to the voters. Whether it is for building construction, technology or for additional operating revenue, we must demonstrate the need.

Just because we have a "window of opportunity" to request enhancement millage is not a reason to go to the taxpayers.

Future Cuts?

Future funding could necessitate program cuts. What programs do you see most affected?
"None. We have no plan to discontinue any programs at this time."

Future funding could necessitate program cuts. What programs do you see most affected?
"Those programs where enrollment has decreased and which fail to adequately address the community's high tech work force needs would be affected first by a funding reduction. As trustee I will strive to develop alternative funding sources as well as take a proactive approach in developing strategies to better communicate the needs of the college to our state Legislature."

Future funding could necessitate program cuts. What programs do you see most affected?
"Schoolcraft College is financially sound. April 1995 became debt free; only four other Michigan community colleges debtless. Fact-driven cost control necessary, maintain balanced budget. Programs that become cost burdens always vulnerable after analysis shows rejuvenation improbable. Cutting viable, needed programs would be last resort, avoid with continued sound management."

Future funding could necessitate program cuts. What programs do you see most affected?
"Schoolcraft is well-managed financially and I do not anticipate a need for program cuts. The college is debt-free, has a healthy budget for the maintenance of its physical plant and receives significant returns from its development authority. Schoolcraft College will continue to offer any courses and programs that are in demand by our community."

Future funding could necessitate program cuts. What programs do you see most affected?
"There are no plans to cut programs at this time. The college continuously evaluates programs for their relevance. In this way Schoolcraft determines the needs of the students, businesses and community members and does provide appropriate programs."

Vocational Programs

What indicators should be assessed to learn the needs of the communities relative to the development of vocational programs at SCC?
"Started environmental tech program. Also, now offer post-associate certificates in culinary arts, computer information services, biomedical systems, and laser industrial applications."

What indicators should be assessed to learn the needs of the communities relative to the development of vocational programs at SCC?
"Vocational programs must be a priority for the college. Schoolcraft is in a unique position to train individuals in a variety of technical fields which are represented by area businesses. The needs of the business community for specially trained employees should be continually assessed through market research and commissioned task forces comprised of faculty and area business leaders."

What indicators should be assessed to learn the needs of the communities relative to the development of vocational programs at SCC?
"Evaluation factors include: community, business needs assessment; job opportunities; investment, facilities, staff required; professional degree transferability. Recently authorized environmental technology associate degree; post associate degree certificates: integrated manufacturing; biomedical applications; culinary management; computer information systems; laser industrial applications; materials science."

What indicators should be assessed to learn the needs of the communities relative to the development of vocational programs at SCC?
"Schoolcraft plays an important role in preparing our residents for careers in the sciences, manufacturing, health, law enforcement and culinary arts fields. The college must further its strong ties to industry and economic development agencies to ensure that its courses meet the current and future demands of industry."

What indicators should be assessed to learn the needs of the communities relative to the development of vocational programs at SCC?
"As previously mentioned, constant assessment is required. Schoolcraft recently revised the technology curriculum because of changing demands of business and industry. The college has established a new environmental technology associate degree program; tri-level certificate and degree model which added a post-associate certificate to existing pre-associate and associate degree."

Seniors Programs

What is your position on adopting or adding more avocational or vocational programs for senior citizens?
"We offer a wide variety of programs to all citizens. Senior adults who live in the college district may take classes at 50 percent savings."

What is your position on adopting or adding more avocational or vocational programs for senior citizens?
"Schoolcraft currently offers a number of programs for senior citizens. I would encourage the college to expand on its existing programs. The college should reach out to seniors residing throughout the district and provide both educational and recreational activities on and off campus."

What is your position on adopting or adding more avocational or vocational programs for senior citizens?
"Senior citizens are visible, highly valued at Schoolcraft as students; volunteers; cultural, fitness, recreational program participants, Foundation contributors. Seniors receive credit, non-credit class tuition reductions. As population ages, live longer, more active life styles, increasing attention must be given to seniors' needs: personal development, cultural, preparation/re-skilling for jobs."

What is your position on adopting or adding more avocational or vocational programs for senior citizens?
"Schoolcraft College has an obligation to provide education and enrichment for senior citizens in our community. The college does this well and its 75 percent tuition discount for seniors makes these programs an excellent value and resource for our community. I support greater involvement of seniors in the design and scheduling of these programs."

What is your position on adopting or adding more avocational or vocational programs for senior citizens?
"Senior citizens currently can enroll in classes at a reduced fee. Many of the classes in continuing education provide opportunities for enrichment and self-improvement. As more, older adults return to school the campus is enriched by that involvement. In addition to courses there are many activities on campus in which seniors can participate. Many senior adults provide a wonderful service to the college through volunteer activities."

Community Contributions

What should be done to enhance and promote SCC's presence and contributions to the communities it serves?
"Our image has been built by satisfied students telling others. We receive very good news coverage from the Observer and other newspapers. Our strength is the flexibility to respond quickly to the needs of the people in our communities."

What should be done to enhance and promote SCC's presence and contributions to the communities it serves?
"Schoolcraft should engage in a program of outreach to the entire community and in particular to area youth. This can be accomplished through increased participation and sponsorship of community activities. Schoolcraft's focus should be to establish itself as a legitimate alternative to four-year institutions. Its identity can only be enhanced by a more active role in community events."

What should be done to enhance and promote SCC's presence and contributions to the communities it serves?
"Schoolcraft publications reach most district households, college, community events attract thousands annually. Newspaper, magazine, TV coverage, speakers bureau, board/staff participation community organizations/events. Specific programs high school, middle school, student/parents. Focus quality, cost value, accessibility, innovative programming. Radcliff has become important college, Garden City community resource."

What should be done to enhance and promote SCC's presence and contributions to the communities it serves?
"The college must coordinate its job training activities more closely with the business recruitment and retention efforts of economic development agencies. It must better utilize its advisory boards for academic programs and expand its distance learning and weekend college offerings."

What should be done to enhance and promote SCC's presence and contributions to the communities it serves?
"The more people that are attracted to events on campus, the farther the reputation of the college will grow. Therefore, it is important to continue to expand opportunities for involvement such as lectures, concerts, recitals, dinners, luncheons and workshops. Schoolcraft has been fortunate to receive excellent coverage in the Observer Newspapers that helps to promote its activities. The facilities of the college will continue to be available for outside activities in an effort to enhance its contribution to the communities it serves."

Mrs. Gould moved to Northville in 1987. She was a homemaker.

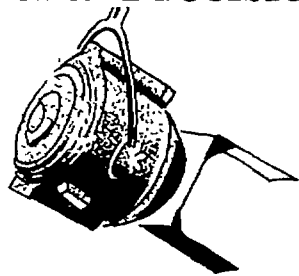

SADD makes dramatic point about drinking and driving

The Northville High School chapter of Students Against Drunk Driving brought a grave and chilling message to the school last Friday about the way, drinking and driving can affect teenagers.

The school's SADD chapter participated in grim reaper day to illustrate the national statistic that one student is killed every 11 minutes in a drunk driving accident.

Senior Bernie Tomsa dressed up as the Grim Reaper and appeared in various classrooms every 20 minutes. When a student was tapped on the shoulder he or she represented a victim of drunken driving.

The victims left class to paint their faces white and dress in black, symbolizing their death. Those students picked by the reaper then returned to class and could not speak for the rest of the day. Announcements of which students had been "killed" were made over the PA system throughout the day.

By the end of the day, 30 stu-

dents had been picked by Tomsa. SADD president Lindsey Casterline said she hopes students take the message to heart.

"I think this will make more people aware of how many teenagers that die," Casterline said.

This is the third time that SADD has staged grim reaper day. Charlie Stilec, student assistance coordinator at the high school and SADD adviser, said the end of the school year, when students are more apt to celebrate with alcohol, is the perfect time to get the message across.

"This will give families and kids the message that tragedy can strike at any time," Stilec said.

Although the combination of alcohol and driving are hazardous for any driver, the effects are more detrimental in teenagers who are still learning to drive, Stilec said.

This year's SADD organization has been an extremely active one, with at least 30 highly involved members, Casterline said. SADD was responsible for bringing in the Chrysler Drunk Driving Simulator last fall, a vehicle with delayed

breaking and steering mechanisms that simulate the effects of driving under the influence.

The group also helped organize Red Ribbon Week in March, which included an appearance by motivational speaker Laurie Stewart. As part of the activities, SADD members staged skits about peer pressure and substance abuse at the elementary schools.

Currently, 300 students at Northville High have signed contracts through SADD pledging not to drink and drive.

Despite the commitment from a large number of students at the high school, SADD member Farb Nivi and other students said there is still a problem.

"I know I can approach at least one person at any party who is drunk and is about to drive - and they usually have other people riding with them," Nivi said. "It's not hard to find somebody who's about to drive who has been drinking. But at the same time, there are a lot of responsible people out there who would volunteer to drive for them."

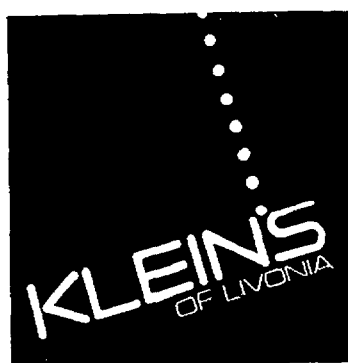

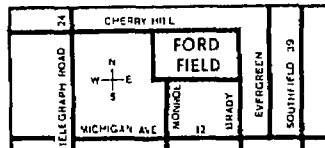

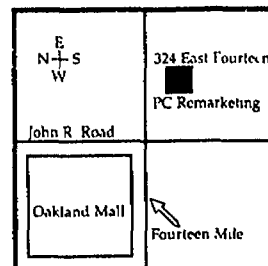

For those who have a Puritan work ethic, from 1-3 p.m. there will be ice cream making in the farm demonstration building.

Celebrators will be able to make the dessert with an old-fashioned hand crank that blends the cream, milk, sugar and ice into the favorite birthday cake accompaniment.

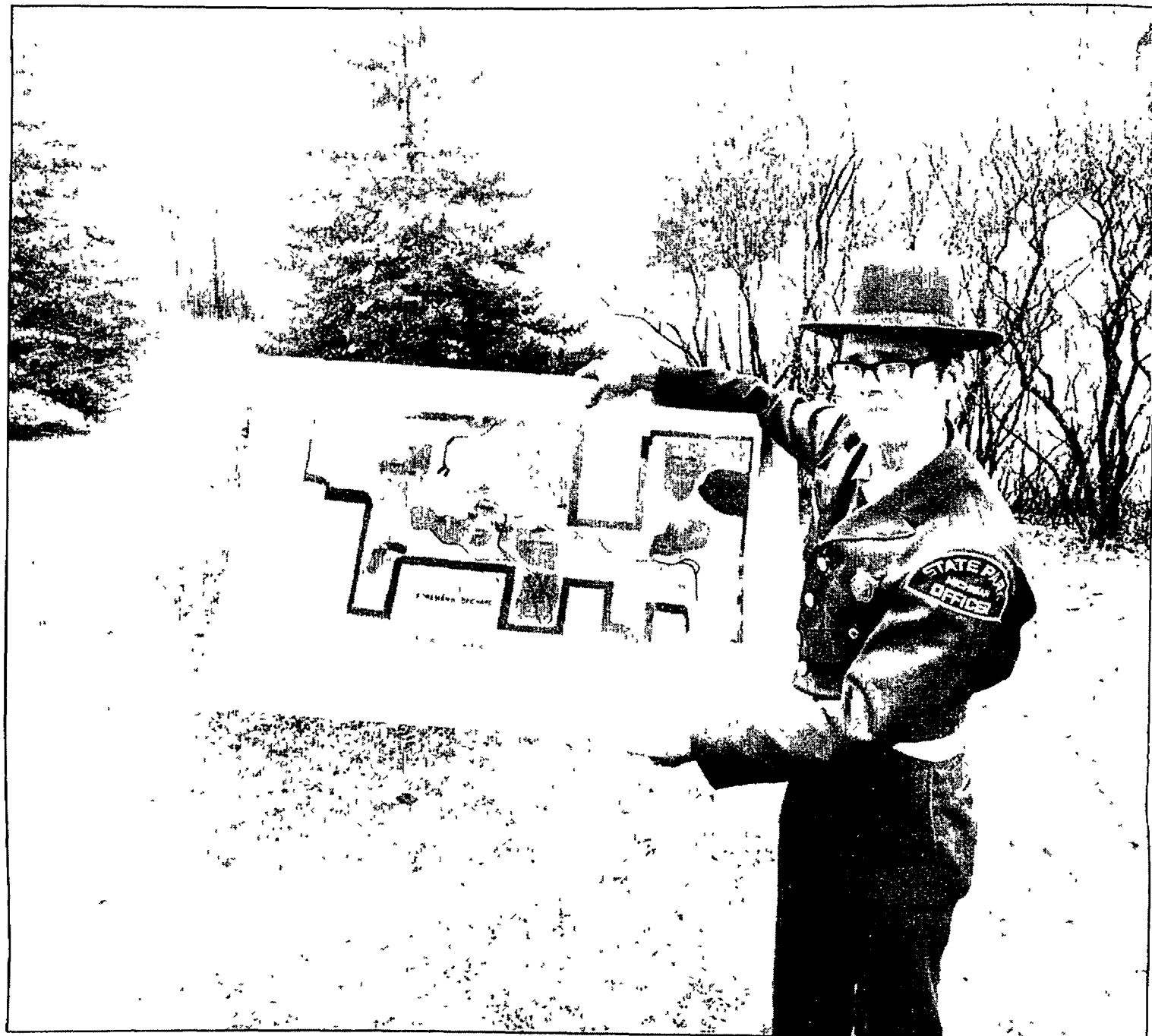
The entire process takes about 20 to 30 minutes and is a popular activity, especially with children, Gourlay said.

"It should be fun."

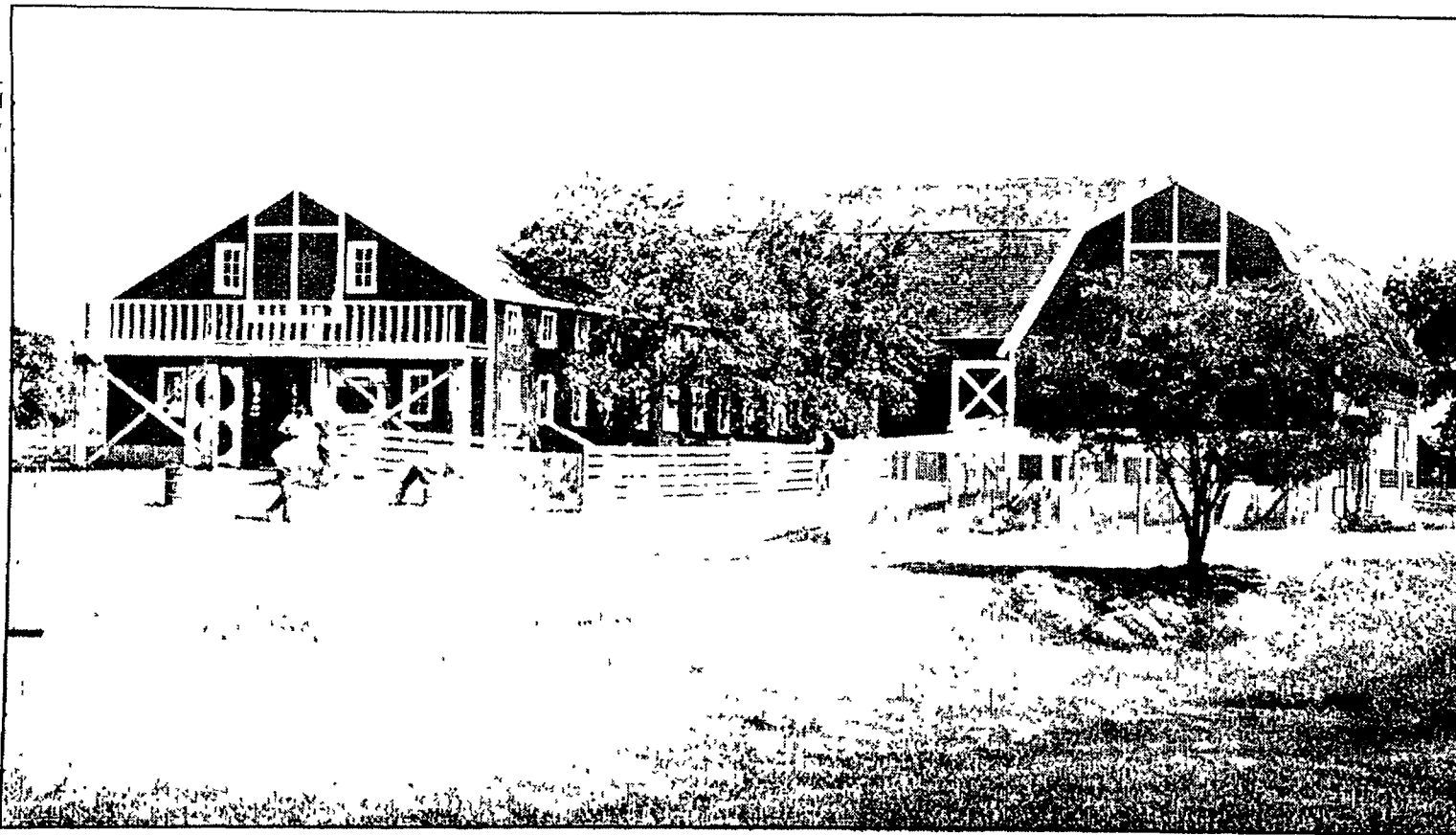

'Down on the farm' has authentic ring at park

Maybury State Park isn't just a place to go for a summer barbecue or a winter cross-country ski trip. You can also experience an age-old, slowly dying American institution: the small family farm.

Most people were farmers when our nation began. That changed over the next two centuries as the United States developed an industrial might unparalleled in world history. While the transformation has brought America vast economic, political and military success, it did exact a price — the slow but steady disappearance of family farming.

Today less than 3 percent of Americans are involved in farming, many of them associated with

large-scale corporate agricultural operations. Most of us have rarely, if ever, had the chance to take in the sights, sounds and, yes, smells of a real farm. These are the sensations that formed the backdrop of life for many of our ancestors and are a vital part of our heritage.

That's why the state of Michigan, when it bought Maybury in the early 1970s, decided to set off 40 of the park's 944 acres to create a living farm.

"The idea was to have a place to introduce city kids to farm life," current farm manager John Beemer explained. "We want them to be able to experience what it looks like, what it feels like — even what it smells like."

Beemer, a 30-year park ranger with the Michigan Department of

Natural Resources (MDNR), has been bringing in the crops and caring for the animals at Maybury for the past 17 years. He, his family, a full-time farmer and seasonal and summer help, keep the farm running smoothly and play host to about 100,000 visitors a year, most of them schoolchildren.

"We try to give the image of early 20th century," Beemer said. "Whatever you'd find on a 1900 to 1920s era farm."

The farm's favorite attractions are its animals, including four draft horses, two dairy cows and a pair of beef cattle, sheep, pigs, goats, chickens, ducks, geese and rabbits.

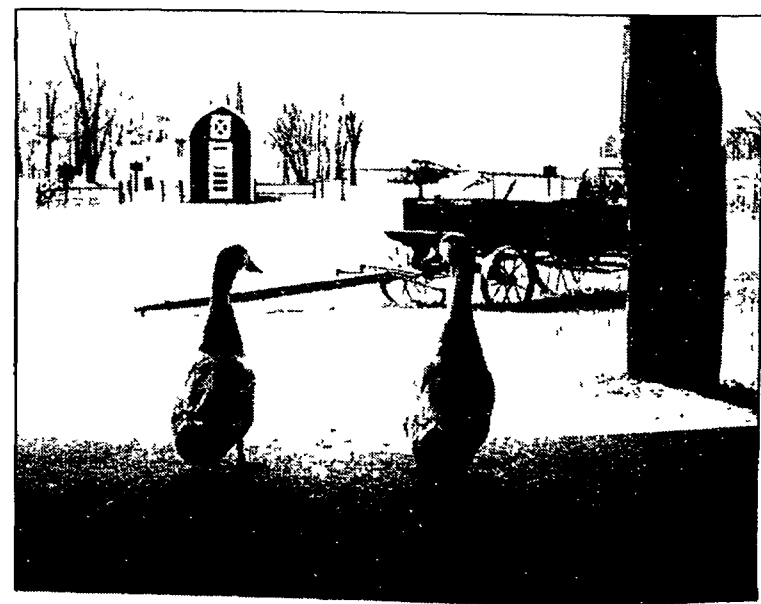
Crops are a farm staple as well, used for animal feed. Corn, oats, wheat and hay sit in neat plots,

swaying in the breeze as harvest time approaches. A few small demonstration plots border the playground near Maybury's concession stand: sunflowers, buckwheat, rye and field beans.

It all began in 1975, shortly after the state bought the old tuberculosis sanatorium off of Eight Mile Road and turned it into a state park. MDNR officials hired Knight Webster, a farmer from Oxford, Mich., to start and run the farm there.

In those days it was only in operation from Memorial Day to Labor Day, Beemer said, but it still drew nearly 30,000 visitors a year.

"It looked different back then," said Beemer, who grew up on a farm near Grand Rapids. "A lot different than now. The shelters

weren't here. The concession stand wasn't here, either. In the winter they used to rent the cross country skis out of one end of the barn. We had to keep the animals separated at the other end."

Then or now, winter is a traditionally slow time for the farm. Not many people visit until the April sun melts away the snow and the year's new kids, lambs and ewes are born and the sheep are shorn, always popular attractions.

"Those always draw a lot of people," Beemer said. "It does get hectic around here at times like that."

The biggest tourist times, he added, are usually April through July and Labor Day through mid-October. Besides helping with the crowds, Beemer said the work involved in running a farm ensures he and his team will never

have to worry about having nothing to do.

"There's always work to do," he said. "You're getting today's jobs done and (besides that) you have to plan now for next year."

Harvesting of the small grains occurs once annually, with hay brought in two or three times. Besides that other animals such as pigs are being born almost every month of the year. The farm staff also offers autumn hayrides and honeybee hive exhibits.

"It all keeps us pretty busy," Beemer said with a chuckle.

That's a sentiment many Americans of yesterday — and few of today — can share.

Remember when it was a TB hospital?

The abundant grounds of Maybury State Park are replete with lush forest and well-manicured open space. On a given afternoon, the park's landscapes are dotted with children scurrying after frisbees and adults strolling leisurely through nature trails.

Today, 20 years after opening as a recreation spot, there is little left to remind visitors that for almost half a century the sprawling tract of land off Eight Mile was the site of attempts to fight a dread disease whose mysteries had eluded medical science for centuries.

The malady, of course, was tuberculosis, often referred to as "consumption" for the way it laid waste to the body's natural defenses.

The William H. Maybury Sanato-

rium, named after a prominent city of Detroit official, offered free care and treatment of TB patients from 1921-69. For most of its existence, it was a virtual city unto itself, with doctors' and nurses' quarters, farm houses, a school and a prison wing, in addition to five hospital wards and several auxiliary buildings.

It pumped its own water, generated its own electricity and harvested its own crops. Children of staff physicians grew up within its confines and specialists of all types spent their careers maintaining its infrastructure.

At peak capacity, it kept 844 beds and employed 480 workers, 233 of whom lived in the compound itself.

"We were a family," said Esther Lockman, a medical record librarian at the facility for 42 years and

the daughter of the hospital's first chief engineer. "We were very close. Everybody was interested in everybody else."

Originally called Detroit Municipal TB Sanatorium and, later, Spring Hill, Maybury grew out of a prevailing belief that "rest therapy" represented the best hope for tuberculosis patients. That approach — combining bed rest and surgical lung collapse procedure to control but not cure TB — gained currency in the late 19th century and culminated in the establishment of several public sanatoria in subsequent decades.

The opening of Maybury was part of a larger campaign to combat the "white plague." Other measures included purging Michigan's cattle stock of bovine-infected cows, the milk of which was a leading cause of TB in humans,

and upgrading housing and sanitary conditions in the city.

The plan of attack seemed to get results. At the time the hospital opened in 1921, the incidence of tuberculosis deaths in the Detroit area was 100 per 100,000. By 1940, the mortality rate stood at 45.5/100,000.

The 1941 publication *Maybury Manual* gave much of the credit for this improvement to the hospital, calling it "the outstanding example of the modern sanatorium."

But, as advanced as it was for its day, Maybury and the rest therapy it practiced made unacceptably slow progress in the battle against the contagious disease.

Medicine continued its relentless pursuit of an outright cure and in 1947 an antibiotic called streptomycin, the first "miracle" drug in the anti-TB arsenal, came on to the scene. Others followed quickly thereafter. Isoniazid, a powerful pharmacological agent, was introduced in 1953.

"That led to the bold statement that we were going to eliminate TB," said Dr. John Romanik, a pediatrician at the Maybury Children's Wing from 1964-69. "There was dancing in the halls."

Tuberculosis medicines did represent a great advance in disease eradication and in the years following widespread use of the drugs TB mortality rates dropped dramatically. According to Dr. Romanik, antibiotics transformed the mood at the hospital during its last 15 years of operation.

"Not one single child died at Maybury after 1954," he said.

Dr. Romanik said streptomycin, isoniazid and other drugs such as PAS revolutionized TB treatment and rendered sanatoria such as Maybury obsolete.

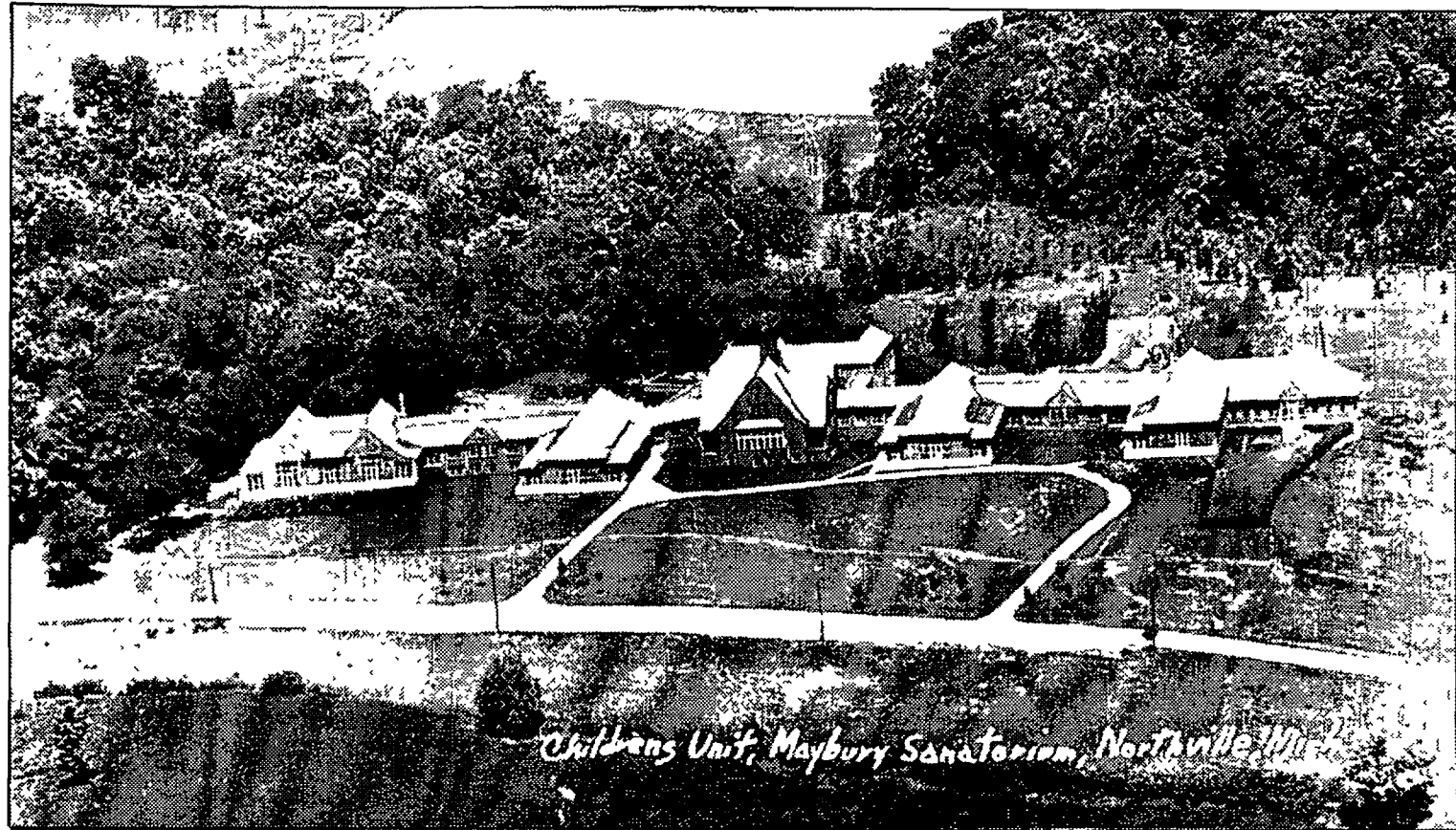
"The city was pumping money into it but there were no advances. They got tired of pouring money into it."

The Detroit Board of Health finally made the decision to close the facility in 1969.

Decades after the discovery of the new medicines, TB is still a health threat but not the devastating contagion of another time. AIDS and bacterial resistance have led to an increase in reports of TB cases worldwide.

The state of Michigan purchased the former hospital grounds from Detroit for \$3 million in 1971, taking four years to demolish the structures inside the grounds and prepare the land for a park. The badly vandalized buildings were razed, the land was cleared, and a clay liner for a 10-acre fishing lake was laid.

Grounds keepers now mow a long, narrow patch of grass where the main hospital building stood so that people in search of the past can know the approximate location of the facility. That swath and a narrow asphalt road running parallel to it are the only indicators of what was once Maybury Sanatorium.

Name of the game at the park is fun

If Maybury State Park is one of those best-kept secrets you often hear about, someone must have circulated a rumor about the place.

"We were really busy last weekend," said parks supervisor Anna Sylvester. "There were about 4,000 people here for the Botsford picnic."

Like many attractions, the park seems to be popular with everyone except those who live near it.

"A lot of people around here don't even know about all the things we have," park interpreter Karen Gourlay said.

Maybury representatives feel that the park's 20th anniversary is a good time to entice people to come out and see the recreation area, so a birthday celebration is planned for Sunday, June 11.

Maybury, a city of Detroit tuber-

culosis hospital from 1921-69, opened as a state park in 1975.

A craft show, walking tour, cake cutting ceremony and hayrides are just some of the events on tap to mark the occasion. But the real star of the show, of course, will be the 954 acres of forest, hills, trails and open areas that make up the park.

Sylvester waxes poetic when she speaks about the natural beauty of Maybury, and she should know — she lives on the grounds in one of the houses provided for the staff of the old hospital.

"The downside to living at the park is that I get calls at all hours of the night. But I love it. It's beautiful here," she says.

"It's one of the most kid-oriented parks around. It really caters to families."

And families is what you'll find at Maybury year-round. The park is open 365 days a year.

With miles of trails for walking, hiking and biking, plus horseback riding, fishing and picnic shelters, the park is a natural draw for outdoor enthusiasts of all ages.

"The whole purpose of this park is for people to enjoy it," Sylvester added. "Mr. Maybury would be pretty happy. There's not a big subdivision here."

"Mr. Maybury" is the city of Detroit official who was instrumental in the founding of the TB center in 1921. The sanatorium that bore his name was based on the principles of rest therapy, which held that tuberculosis could be controlled through bed rest and medical treatment.

The state kept the name Maybury after buying the land from Detroit and converting it into a state park in 1975.

If William Maybury was someone who believed in the therapeutic value of the great outdoors, or just

somebody who liked to kick back with friends and family, he would indeed be pleased to see the current condition of his namesake.

In addition to hiking and nature trails, the park offers a 10-12 acre lake in which anglers can catch bass, blue gill and perch.

The lake is man-made and was stocked by the state Department of Natural Resources when the park first opened. Few people knew about the lake at that time, allowing the pond to mature without disruption. As a result, the fish stock is now plentiful.

For those who just want to relax around a picnic table and grill, scores of individual sites ensure constant availability for small parties.

The park also offers a petting farm and demonstrations, in addition to nature programs.

Daily permits for the park are \$4. Yearly permits cost \$20.

Maybury State Park, established 1975, operated by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, Parks & Rec Division.

OIS still looking at second building

As the Optical Imaging Systems (OIS) plant in Northville Township comes up to full operating steam this summer company officials continue to explore the possibility of building a second, bigger computer facility next door.

OIS in November opened the \$100 million manufacturing and research plant near Five Mile and Beck. The plant, lauded as an example of cutting-edge technology, will develop and manufacture flat-panel computer screens primarily for use in military aircraft.

Even before the doors opened, however, company officials have been exploring the idea of opening up an even bigger plant right next to it. That plant would make computer and electronics products for the civilian market. Company officials are now in the middle of researching the complex project's feasibility.

"The studying is continuing," OIS spokesperson Charles Wilson said. "This kind of project would be a lot bigger and a lot more expensive than our existing plant. We've always said we'd like to take this step but there's a lot to study."

Wilson said that no decisions of any kind about the project have been made, adding that it's far too early for that.

The spokesperson would not discuss specific numbers but indicated that the plant would likely be bigger in size than the current facility and that the cost would be in the hundreds of millions of dollars.

Flat-panel computers are slimmer and clearer than conventional screens. OIS is reportedly interested in manufacturing "notebook" portable computers and computer display screens for automobiles.

In June 1994 the company announced a deal with the Apple corporation to make the display panels for that firm's future line of notebook computers. Some estimates put the worldwide market for civilian flat-panel goods at between \$10 billion and \$20 billion.

OIS bought the 30 acres for its current plant from Wayne County for \$10, county officials arguing that the deal was justified because of the jobs and tax revenue the deal brought in. Wilson declined to comment on published reports that OIS has checked with county officials about buying 40 more acres of land it owns next to its present site.

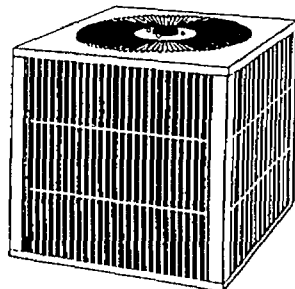

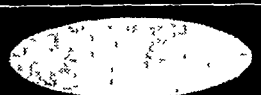

CERVICAL TRACTION

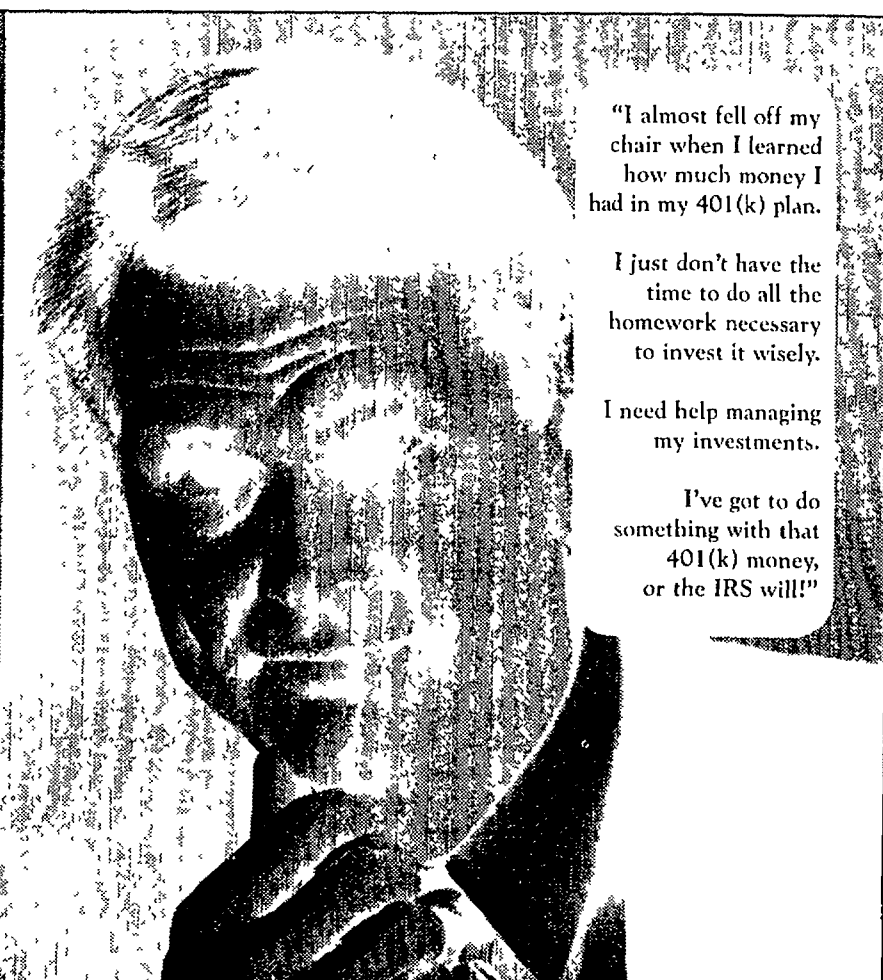
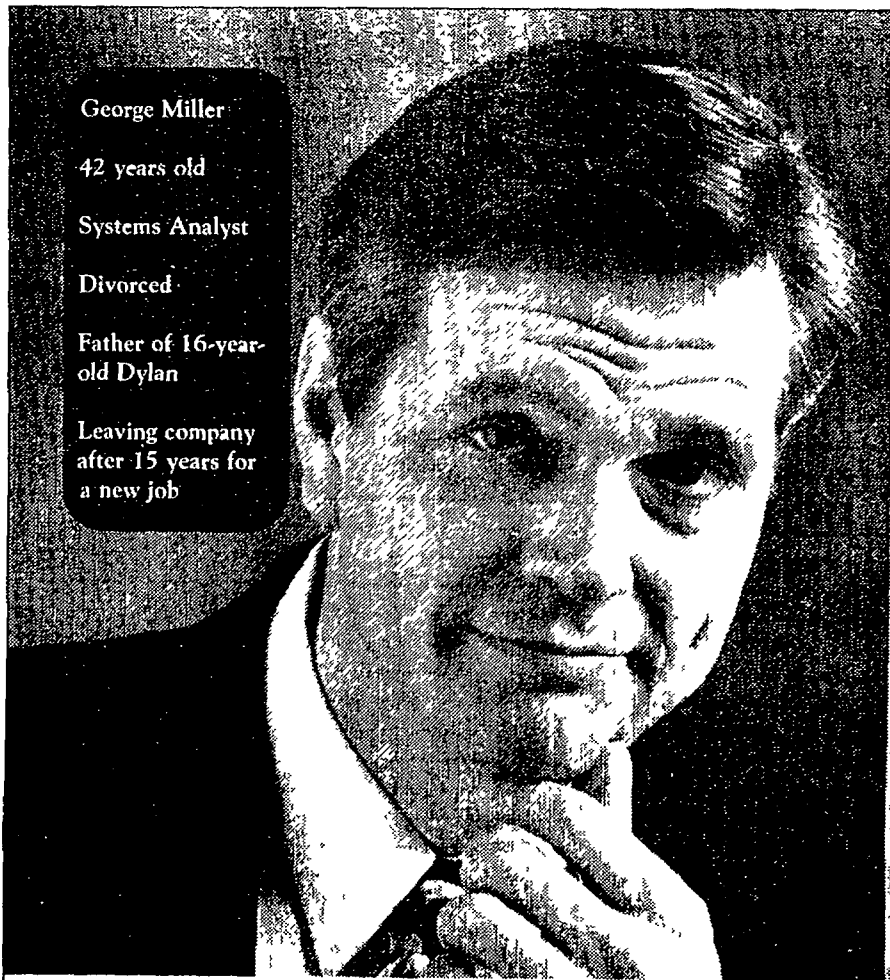

Mill Race Matters

Mill Race Village will be open on Sunday, June 11, from 2 p.m. until 5 p.m. Docents will be on hand to provide tours of the eight village structures. The only charge for visiting is a donation. City residents are invited to come and bring friends.

The village, a city park, is located on Griswold one block north of Main Street. The buildings, all moved to the location from other places in this community, tell us of this area's past.

Wash Oak School is the only building on site not originally within the city. It gets its name because it stood originally on the Washtenaw-Oakland County border. First constructed in 1873, it is used today to take students back to an earlier time and allow them to experience school life before the modern era.

New School Church constructed in 1845 by a splinter group of the Northville Presbyterian congregation was located previously on the southeast corner of Main and Wing. Northville Square (MAGS) sits there today. It served only four years as a church and 72 years as a village library.

During its lifetime it has served other purposes as well. Among them it became the regular meeting place for the Northville Woman's Club established in 1893 and still in existence. It also spearheaded creation of the Northville Historical Society and Mill Race Village.

Hirsch Blacksmith Shop was constructed on location. It replicates the structure used during the last half of the 19th century by John Hirsch as a blacksmith shop. The original structure stood until the 1920s at Main and Hutton (northeast). The replica serves as a working blacksmith shop and houses the village's country store.

Cady Inn, the oldest of the village's structures dates from 1831. Its first location is indefinite, but for over 100 years it sat on the north side of East Cady midway between Griswold and Church. Local legal records reveal that the building served as an early inn in this community predating regular stage or rail service.

The Interurban Station stood originally at Newburgh Road and Eight Mile. It was used as a waiting room along the rapid transit line system which ran from Farmington to Northville. A second line connected Northville to Plymouth and ran down today's Northville Road. The lines operated between 1899 and 1929.

Hunter House, a Greek revival, served originally as home to Stephen and Mary Cady Hunter. They had two children. The building was constructed between 1848 and 1850.

Hunter had just arrived in the area from Aberdeen, Scotland, with a brother, William, when he married local resident Mary (either a niece or sister-in-law of Daniel). Stephen Hunter died of influenza in 1853. Although

records say he is buried locally, he is not recorded in any area cemetery.

Yerkes House takes its name from first owners William Purdy Yerkes and his wife, Sarah (Sallie) Cady Yerkes. William arrived in Northville as a child with a party of 14 that included his parents, grandfather, aunts and uncles. Sarah was the only child who lived to adulthood of Daniel Cady and his second wife Eliza Ellsworth.

William and Sarah had no children. Their home built just after the Civil War preserves Victorian architecture beautifully and demonstrates how professional people of the era lived. Yerkes served as a lawyer and a judge as well as first president for the Village of Northville. During the Civil War he helped recruit servicemen for duty.

Cottage House, built about 1890, was donated to the Historical Society by Paul and Mamie Folino and stood originally on Center just across from today's Shopping Center Market.

It served as a family residence and at one time was used to house staff of the dairy located next door.

At Mill Race Village it is used by the Weaver's Guild for demonstrating the craft of hand weaving fabric. The garden at its side contains plants used for the creation of dyes for fabric.

Lawmakers wrangle over court funding

The trial court funding debate became partisan June 1 as Democratic state representatives took up the cudgel on behalf of outstate courts.

Republicans had to field every vote to gain 56-48 passage of the \$315 million judicial budget bill. All area Republicans voted yes.

"This crisis may become a constitutional crisis," warned Rep. Nick Ciaramitaro, D-Roseville, arguing the budget bill was too low.

"The (Supreme) Court could order funding. It could happen."

Added Rep. Thomas Mathieu, D-Grand Rapids: "This is the 15th year the promise has not been kept to fully fund outstate courts. We shouldn't let the bill leave this House."

Mathieu referred to a 1980 law under which the Legislature began paying for Wayne Circuit, Detroit Records and Detroit District courts, with a promise to phase in outstate courts later. Two recessions, however, have halted the process.

Republicans listened to Rep. Terry Geiger, R-Lake Odessa, who

urged them to pass the bill as written and negotiate with the Senate in a conference committee.

Meanwhile, 80 outstate counties sued the state for full funding of operating costs. After years of lower court battles, the Supreme Court on March 10 heard oral arguments and is expected to rule by the end of 1995.

Mathieu and the Michigan Association of Counties hope the high court orders full state funding. If so, the case would be kicked back to Ingham Circuit Court for what could be years of hearings on damages that could cost the state, \$1 billion.

The House's brief but hot debate occurred just two days after a task force assembled by the Supreme Court recommended state funding of "core costs" of trial courts - judicial and staff salaries, a computer system, jury costs and attorneys for indigents.

That panel recommended more centralized administration of trial courts - circuit, probate, recorders, and district.

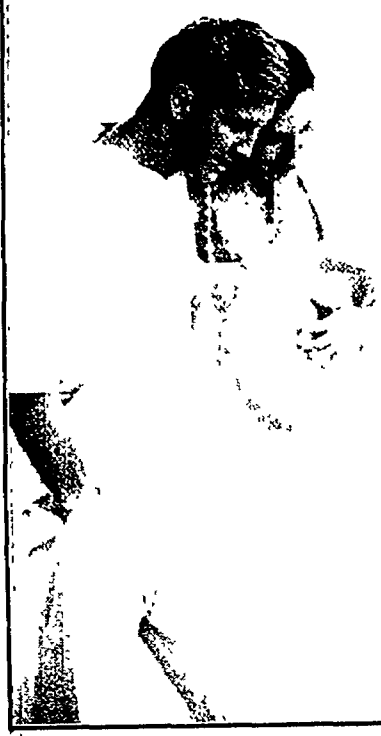

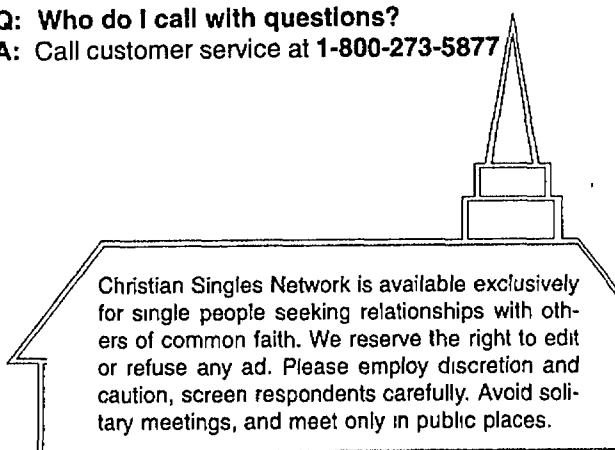

go from freshmen to seniors so it's special for me," Johnson said. "They're a great group of kids."

School officials are praying for kind weather Friday night, but if rain does occur graduation will be held in the gymnasium.

Seating for the football stadium is unlimited. However, if the ceremony must be held indoors, students are limited to bringing four family members each. Additional friends and loved ones will be able to view the ceremony from television monitors in the cafeteria and auditorium if graduation is moved inside.

This year's Distinguished Alumnus will be Northville City Mayor Chris Johnson, who will make a short speech at the ceremony. A 1973 Northville High School graduate, Johnson has been mayor of the city since 1987 and served on the Northville Board of Education from 1976-1987.

Officials send church back to drawing board

residents oppose - calls for the church to share space with a 280,000 square foot commercial shopping center and 84 acres of open space.

Ward officials and Gary Sakwa, who wants to develop the commercial center, recently added 7.7 more acres of open space to the plan, up from 76.3 acres. The gain came from chopping the commercial center's size and eliminating more than 850 parking spaces, reducing the total number of spaces to 3,986.

How the two plans would affect

traffic at the clogged Six Mile/Haggerty intersection was a major topic of discussion. The office plan, both sides agreed, would bring more traffic than the commercial center during morning and afternoon weekday rush hours. They added, though, that the commercial plan would mean more traffic on the weekends.

Sakwa, meanwhile, made an unusual offer. He said that if the commercial plan is approved he will give the township the \$500,000 it would need to secure a \$2.5 million federal grant to widen Six Mile for 2,000 feet west of its intersection with Six Mile.

The snag, however, is that

Northville would have to apply for the grant by the end of the summer and the odds are heavily against them agreeing to both a conceptual and a formal site plan before then.

Crime was another major issue. Some fear that the commercial center, which is more than twice the size of the Meijer store that keeps township police so busy, would become a magnet for criminals. In a written report, however, Director of Public Safety Chip Snider said that was unlikely.

Comparing Meijer to the center is an apples-oranges proposition, Snider said. The two complexes aren't the same kind of places, he

maintained, adding that Ward and Sakwa could avoid potential problems with good planning. He suggested they adopt the security measures Meijer has used to reduce crime in recent years.

"Meijer's problems were inherent only to Meijer," Snider said.

Traffic will be a problem, however, Snider added. He recommended that the township require Ward and Sakwa to arrange for special traffic control measures as needed, such as during Sunday worship services. He opposed having township police do it, as that would mean extra expense and the potential for insurance liability risks.

Signs will urge no feeding of ducks and geese

overweight problem with many of the birds, may alter migration patterns and contributes to pollution of the park through excessive food litter and animal feces on the ground.

Northville resident Mary Braddock, who said she spends \$20-\$25 a week on bread and corn for the birds, does not believe feeding the animals creates a health hazard.

"I haven't seen an unhealthy duck there," she said. "I don't buy any of it."

Bird feeding at the park is a community tradition, which Braddock does not want to see come to an end.

"Feeding the birds has been a tradition long before I moved to Northville," said Braddock, who moved to the community in 1978.

"Northville has been known as the duck town. People have gotten more benefit from feeding the ducks. They have an empathy for animals. And the faces on the little kids when they feed them - they're all smiles."

Mayor Pro Tem Carolann Ayers said she appreciated the tradition of feeding waterfowl at the park, but felt the health hazards were too important to ignore.

"I know it's been a tradition, but since we know more about the hazards with bird waste, it's necessary," she said.

Planning commissioner Michelle Kelly, whose law office is located across the street from the park, said at the city planning commission meeting Tuesday that she has also seen rats in the area and believes the ducks present a traffic hazard.

"Six to seven times a day I hear

cars screeching to a halt to let ducks cross," she said.

Also Monday night, the council approved the purchase of three signs that ask visitors to refrain from feeding.

The proposed signs will read:
For their sake ... Please Do Not Feed the Ducks and Geese.

Why? Because artificial feeding can ...

- cause overweight and unhealthy birds

- alter the migration patterns of waterfowl

- encourage the spread of disease

- contribute to pollution in Ford Park Pond.

In addition, a health department official told Johnson that the sodium from bread, crackers and processed food depletes gosling eggs of calcium, leaving them weak and more susceptible to death, she said.

Visitors are also leaving food and other items in the park like open pizza boxes with the crusts still in them, which worsens the problem, Johnson said.

"People are literally putting garbage down there," she said.

In a letter addressed to City

Clerk Delphine Gutowski last year. Jack Barron, risk control consultant from the Michigan Municipal Management Authority, outlined some of the problems in the area.

"I was able to personally visit the site ... To say the wildlife population at the site was large would be an understatement. We believe it is in the best interest, not only of residents of Northville but other visitors to discourage feeding at the park. We remain concerned about the potential health hazards associated with bacteria and how it may impact the growth of algae in the water. The city is also deal-

ing with wildlife in-breeding," the letter stated.

Consideration of the resolution began earlier this year when the city gained ownership of the eight acres in the area to use for public park purposes.

The resolution is part of the Parks and Recreation Commission's Ford Pond Park master plan, which includes the addition of pedestrian bridges and fishing docks. The commission presented its plan to the Planning Commission Tuesday night. The plan will be discussed in a public hearing at a city council meeting June 19.

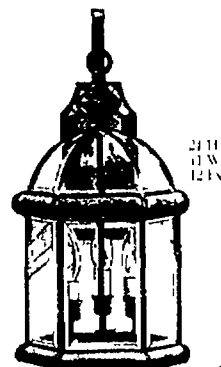
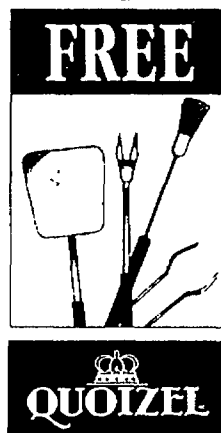

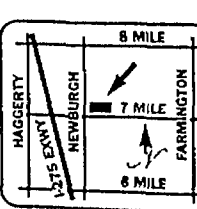

"We are really excited about this," said Traci Johnson, director of the Parks and Recreation Department. "This plan will make the area a real community center."

The plan, which commission members have worked on since last fall, will set the framework for park renovations and allow the city to begin applying for grants for the project.

The entire plan, however, will most likely have to be completed on a piece-meal basis with various projects being phased in over several years when funding is available, Johnson said.

The entire development project will cost roughly \$600,000 to complete, with construction projects split up into five separate phases.

As part of the document, the commission recommended the city adopt a resolution prohibiting the feeding of waterfowl in the area - a favorite pastime of many visitors to the park. Northville City Council members adopted the resolution Monday night and signs asking visitors not to feed the animals will be installed in the area soon.

A public hearing on the master plan will be held during the city council's regular meeting Monday, June 19, at 7:30 p.m.

Specifics of the plan include:

- Constructing an eight-foot-wide asphalt pedestrian walkway throughout the park.
- Constructing two pedestrian bridges: one to connect the parking lot west of Griswold to Mill Race Historical Village and another to go over the Mill Pond area east of the Ford Plant.

- Adding picnic areas and fishing and observation decks around Mill Pond.
- Constructing an open-air gazebo and deck near the Ford Plant's water wheel.
- Adding signage describing the historical background of the Henry Ford Plant and waterwheel.
- Developing a 60-car parking lot on the west side of Griswold Street, including resurfacing the area with new asphalt and improving the storm water drainage system. The area is currently used as a lot to park cars for McDonald Ford.
- Installing a playground structure west of the parking lot, including climbing, swinging and sliding apparatuses.
- Expanding the soccer field to regulation size and constructing a new baseball/softball field to regulation standards. The western portion of the existing parking lot will be removed to create space for the two fields.

"What's neat about the plan is that there are both opportunities for recreational use and passive use like picnicking," Johnson said. "So there's something for everyone."

Johnson said she plans to seek grants from the Department of Natural Resources and line up corporate sponsors to help fund the project. She is also considering holding some fund-raising events that may help move the project along.

The city is on its way to making some progress with the plan by working to acquire the roughly two acres west of Griswold Street where McDonald Ford currently parks its cars.

Northville has received preliminary approval for a \$150,000 grant from the state to purchase the land.

Closing of psychiatric center likely within next few years

It's been more like in the next few years."

Geake chairs a Senate subcommittee which deals with mental health issues.

During budget hearings last month state legislators discussed the idea of "increasing the pace of the hospital's closing" as a cost-saving measure, Geake staffer Randall Johnson said, "but that idea was ultimately rejected."

If and when the hospital closes patients there would either be transferred to other facilities or receive care from private hospitals under contract with the state.

The hearings dealt with Republican efforts to cut millions in

spending from the state's mental health budget in the coming fiscal year.

The Michigan Department of Mental Health (DMH) will account for about \$1 billion of the projected \$8.4 billion general fund state budget next year. As part of their ongoing effort to cut overall government spending, Gov. John Engler and the GOP-controlled state Legislature have agreed to slash \$20 million from the mental health budget.

Most of the cuts - some \$11 million of the total - would come from reducing the amount of increase in staff personnel at state mental health facilities, Johnson said.

The remaining \$9 million will come from "making operations

more efficient" and from spending cuts, Johnson said.

The staff reductions will affect the hospital, as well as the Hawthorn and Fairlane children's centers located near Seven Mile and Haggerty, Johnson said. The overall impact, however, won't be significant, Geake added.

"We're trying not to shut down facilities wholesale because of the impact it would have on services to the citizens," Johnson said. "We're trying to be careful."

The mental health department budget may go to the full Senate as early as tomorrow, June 9. Officials say the chances are good that both the House, Senate and Engler will agree to the reductions.

Schall gets position as Dole staffer

Ann Arbor Republican John Schall has joined the staff of U.S. Senate Majority Leader Bob Dole, R-Kansas.

Schall will serve as Assistant to the Republican Leader with responsibilities for federal budget issues.

Schall lost a bid for the U.S.

Congress in Michigan's 13th District last November. He was defeated by Lynn Rivers, though he came out on top in the Northville precincts of the district.

Schall served as Chief of Staff of the U.S. Department of Labor from 1991-93, and worked in the White House under President George

Bush as deputy of the White House Domestic Policy Council from 1989-91.

Schall is a 1982 graduate of the University of Michigan and holds a master of public policy degree from Harvard University's John F. Kennedy School of Government.

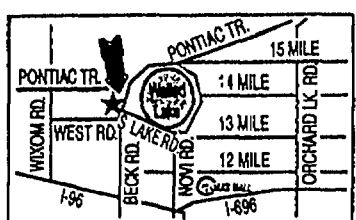

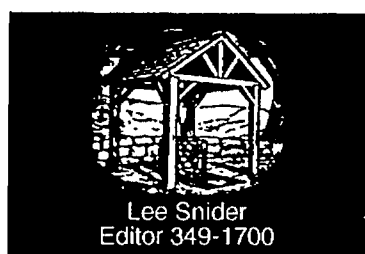

Write-in candidate too late to be viable

School district parent Annette Minard threw us for a loop this week when she announced she was mounting a write-in campaign for school board. Minard has been active in the district on many levels and clearly speaks with an informed voice on a wide range of education-related issues.

It's a shame she decided so belatedly to throw her hat into the ring.

Her decision to enter the previously-uncontested race has forced an endorsement editorial from this newspaper. No endorsement was necessary before, when the three announced candidates were assured reelection to the board.

But Minard's last-minute entry into the field has forced us to discount her candidacy and give the nod to her opponents, Board President **Robert McMahon** and Vice President **Richard Brown**. Appointed trustee Barb Bennett is running for a 1-year unexpired term in a separate, uncontested race.

McMahon and Brown are incumbents on the board and have gone through the usual procedure of submitting nominating petitions and placing their names before the community. They responded to our issues questionnaire, which appears on page 6-A of today's edition, and have served as trusted school district representatives for years, McMahon since 1987 and Brown since 1991.

Minard had a good idea in deciding to contest this year's election - she just

came up with her plan too late in the day.

Write-in candidates rarely succeed at the polls, but their campaigns often serve a couple of useful purposes: 1) they provoke debate and provide choice in what would otherwise be pretty lackluster elections; 2) they can help put a previously unknown candidate into position for a future attempt at office.

Unfortunately, Minard came too late to figure into this year's election and help provide the spark that was missing from the campaign. Her visibility, however, could accomplish the objective of helping familiarize the community with her name and, to at least a limited extent, her views.

Whether this was her intent or not, Minard is a welcome player on the school district elective scene. We agree with her belief that choice is a good thing in any election, even as we find fault with her timing.

Northville Board of Education members serve without compensation. Please vote Monday, June 12.

Always tough bucking trend

I think one of the most common complaints about public school districts is that they tend to be top heavy with administrators. People seem to think there are too many high-paid white collar types sitting around in offices sucking up the payroll.

Probably the most frequently voiced criticism of school boards is that they are too uncritical - too compliant with the polished and persuasive administrators who run the show.

I've heard both remarks since I've been here in Northville and I have my own ideas about them. I'll leave the business about the number of administrators to another time, but the 11th-hour campaign of a write-in school board candidate has triggered some thoughts about the perceived passivity of the board of education.

One of the things I heard when I talked to supporters of last-minute hopeful Annette Minard was that this year's uncontested election was lacking something essential - namely choice. Though no one said anything openly critical, there was a vague feeling of discontent with the candidates and even, in a larger sense, with the school board overall.

People seemed to feel that the board as a collective unit lacks energy and vitality. Some of the reports I get about the meetings characterize the sessions as verbal love fests where people fall over each other praising the work they do. There's little in the way of hard debate.

As I said, I've seen and heard all this before and I think it's more the rule than the exception in school districts.

Why do you suppose that is?

When I was in Grosse Ile there was a man there who was a constant thorn in the side of school officials. He attended all the meetings, filed Freedom of Information Act requests and even brought (and won) a lawsuit against the district.

Members of the board and the administration despised him and marshaled all their opposition forces each spring when he'd run for school board.

But even as they were dreading the possibility that he might get elected and take a place at the table with the other trustees, they were muttering, "Maybe that's the best place for him."

You know, it's pretty easy to sit on the sidelines and take your shots without knowing all the intricacies of the issues. It's quite another matter to lash out when the people you're confronting are professional associates and the votes you're casting make up one-seventh of the entire electoral college.

The people in Grosse Ile knew that and that's why they thought their enemy's election to the school board might neutralize him. A similar thing happened in Northville with Pat Custer, who ran as an opposition candidate in 1992 but was largely silent during her years as a board member.

I'd like to see more hard questions tossed as administrators in Northville but I know it's got to be tough.

If it were as easy as it seems, it wouldn't be such a rare occurrence.

Incumbents proven themselves at SCC

Monday, voters in the Northville school district will join their counterparts in Livonia, Plymouth Canton, Garden City and Clarenceville in electing four trustees to the Schoolcraft Community College Board.

Three incumbents - Steve Ragan, Harry Greenleaf and Mary Breen - are challenged by Plymouth attorney Brian Broderick.

Incumbent Carol Strom is unopposed in her bid for a 2-year term expiring June 30, 1997.

Questionnaire answers from the candidates appear on page 7-A of today's newspaper.

Strom, who was appointed to the Schoolcraft Board in February 1994, has been a solid member of the college team. Her experience at the K-12 level as a member of the Livonia Board of Education serves her well as a Schoolcraft trustee.

In the race for three 6-year terms, we recommend **Mary Breen**, **Harry Greenleaf** and **Steve Ragan**.

At this time the Schoolcraft board works well for the students and taxpayers of the college district. The incumbents have a solid record of performance and have more ideas for improvement in the future. They merit voter support on June 12.

Brian Broderick, 28, of Plymouth, an attorney with Leikin & Ingber of Southfield, is an earnest young man and a serious candidate. We give him credit for not taking the easy race for the two-year seat against Strom and taking on the veterans instead. However,

none of the incumbents are sufficiently lacking to warrant bringing an inexperienced newcomer into the fold.

Breen, Greenleaf and Ragan are well-informed and committed to serving the Schoolcraft district students and taxpayers.

Breen, 61, of Plymouth Township spent most of her life in public education as a teacher and administrator. A Schoolcraft board member since 1983, Breen has the advantage of perspective and the wisdom of experience.

Greenleaf, 57, of Livonia is recently retired from an education-oriented position at Ford and currently works part time at the University of Detroit-Mercy.

A veteran of the board, Greenleaf also has the advantage of experience. He brings a much-valued technical and financial expertise to the Schoolcraft Board. He is a fastidious inquisitor of administration personnel. His probing questions are based on a solid foundation of knowledge.

Steve Ragan, 28, of Plymouth is astute for his age and, like a good chess player, thinks two or three moves ahead in terms of Schoolcraft's future.

Ragan is not afraid to raise difficult issues - such as health care costs for employees. He is bright, works hard for the college in his role as trustee and chairman of the board.

In our view, the Schoolcraft district will be best served with the election of Mary Breen, Harry Greenleaf, Steve Ragan and Carol Strom.

The local school board gave raises of 6-7 percent each year for six years and that added 40 percent or more to teachers salaries. With just three percent raises for the next 10 years, Northville will be paying \$70,000 per year.

Like Mitch Albom said in the Free Press, he has been to every city and state that has gambling and he hasn't found one yet that was bailed out with gambling.

My Grosse Pointe teacher client retired in June, 1994. Her W-2 from work for six months plus bonus for retiring early was only \$85,500 plus \$7,200 in retirement pay.

I don't think that \$92,700 was too bad a boot out the door with a guarantee of \$41,600 for the next 10 years.

A time of ideas and leadership

It was quite a gathering last week down at Wayne State University's Walter Reuther Library.

Former Gov. G. Mennen Williams' family - his widow Nancy and his children, Gary and Wendy - was there. So, too, was the family of former U.S. Sen. Blair Moody. And the retired chair of the Michigan NAACP, Arthur Jefferson.

There was a whole slew of old pols, mostly Democrats from the Williams Era. And, rehearsing the stories they wrote, some media tigers of yore: Frank Angelo, who used to be editor of the Detroit Free Press, and columnist Judd Arnett.

How come? The publication by Wayne State University Press of a fine new book, *Win Some, Lose Some*, written by Helen Berthelot, an essential guide to a remarkable period in Michigan's political history.

The cast of characters alone is fascinating. There was Gerhard Mennen Williams, the six-foot-four scion of an old Grosse Pointe family with impeccable Republican credentials, who was only 37 when he astonished everybody in 1948 by winning the governorship. I watched him campaigning when I was much, much younger. The style reminded you of a vacuum cleaner: He literally swept people into his hands.

And there were Hicks and Martha Griffiths, he a lawyer, she a congresswoman-in-the-mak-

ing, and Neil Staebler. Together, they broke the back of the corrupt old guard that had run the Democratic Party for decades and set in motion the citizen-based political movement that came to dominate Michigan politics for the next 20 years.

And finally the author, Helen Berthelot - "Buffy" to her friends, for the way she was a buffer between the organizations she ran and the chaos that so often threatened to envelop them. Now retired and living in Westland, she was the Democratic secret weapon in the countless campaigns she managed, making things hum efficiently behind the scenes.

She started out with the phone company and became an organizer for the Communications Workers of America when she met Williams in 1948 and volunteered. The rest became history. When I first met her as a young man in the early 1960s, she was legend: formidable and quick, with snapping eyes and an efficient manner barely concealing her warmth and material feelings toward her young volunteer corps.

Buffy Berthelot had a good sense of proportion and utility. "My most valuable contribution," she wrote, "was telling him (Williams) what I saw going on, whether it was good or bad." Campaigns in those days relied on volunteers who made things work, not on brilliant issues wonks or expensive media mongers: "It wasn't that I didn't understand the issues and voice my opinions frequently. It was simply that my delight was making the wheels of the campaign go smoothly."

The air at the reception was, literally, thick with old memories. They got me to musing about the contrast between the politics of an

era gone by and those of day.

In that age before television, campaigning was retail, person-to-person, where a firm handshake and a direct look in the eye counted for much. By contrast, today's wholesale politics are infested with images of firmness and directness, created too often out of whole cloth by gifted media consultants and image makers.

Successful political parties back then depended on efficient, highly-motivated volunteers. Because few would volunteer to maintain a corrupt machine, citizen-based political parties imposed a certain self-cleansing quality to the politics of the times.

Ideas counted then, in the days before polling converted a party's principles into the arithmetic sum of the demands of single-interest constituency groups. And leadership consisted in the capability to set out ideas with conviction and passion and decency so as to motivate people to do their best for a cause in which they believed.

As I walked to my car, I had a thought: Although I despise the easy cynicism that holds that all those who practice politics are knaves or fools, it does seem to me that the folks of the Williams Era were larger than life, heroes for their times.

Attempt to block stadium funding fails

The bipartisan team of George Hart and Deborah Whyman failed to block possible state funding of highway work for a new Detroit Tiger Stadium as the Michigan Legislature passed a transportation budget last week.

No funds shall be used for road improvements related to the construction of a new sports stadium," said the amendment which Rep. Whyman, R-Canton, tried to tack on in the House.

The House rejected it, 32-71. Supporting Whyman was Republicans Gerald Law of Plymouth, who represents Wayne County Northville.

Missing the vote was Republican Willis Bullard of Milford, who represents Oakland County Northville.

Democrats rapped the Whyman amendment.

"This closes the door to funding of all stadiums. It's very broadly drafted," said Rep. Lynn Martinez, D-Lansing.

"This question wasn't raised when The Palace at Auburn Hills was constructed. Just when it's in

Detroit," said Rep. Michael Ben-nane, D-Detroit.

Whyman argued that proposed new freeway ramps and highway improvements for a new Tiger Stadium near the Fox Theater District of downtown Detroit "benefits the team, benefits the owners, benefits local government, but it doesn't benefit the taxpayers."

While some girls have hung their prom formals in the closet already, other dresses may still be draped over the back of a chair or worse yet, lay crumpled in a pile on the floor.

Other seniors, however, were busy reaching into the recesses of closets and digging to the bottom of cedar chests to clutch a piece of the past so that they could share one more moment in time with others.

At the recent Prom and Special Occasion Fashion Show at the Novi Senior Center, participants brought formal frocks from decades ago to model or have volunteers model after the luncheon.

Dresses ranged in age from 70 years old to just off the rack and covered every decade from the 1920s to the 1990s.

Cindy Stewart, Public Information Director, modeled a soft peach dress Eleanor Malchie purchased in 1978 at Christmas time for dances and parties.

Stewart was one of the only models able to squeeze into a tiny gray lace "Young Edwardian" dress which had originally been worn to the 1969 Birmingham Groves homecoming. The cost was about \$50.

Novi resident Maxine Gillette brought in her daughter Kay Polarzic's 1965 Northville High School prom dress which Kay had purchased in New York City. The beige lace dress had a pink satin back panel with pink satin bow. Kay wore the dress with long pink gloves and a white bunny wrap. Cost was about \$80.

To represent the 1950's, Ruth Sherlock of Walled Lake, brought in a beaded creme taffeta dress by Dance Original Creations which she purchased in Newark, New Jersey for \$50.

Stewart fit perfectly into Genevieve Burke's first formal

which she purchased in 1940 for \$6.95 when she was employed at Hudson's Department Store. Burke was making \$14 for a six day week as a secretary. She also received a 10 percent employee discount on the purchase.

The formal dress of burgundy taffeta with machine sewn gold embroidered flowers with box pleats on the top of the bodice and sleeves with matching bolero jacket was purchased for a special occasion when Burke had a date with an interior designer who also worked at Hudson's.

Northville resident Marjorie Kelner's flawless figure fit perfectly into the black formal with gold trim that she had worn when she was 16 years old to the 1935 Junior High Prom at Plymouth High School. She bought it on sale at Kline's Department Store on Woodward Avenue in Detroit for \$10.95. Kelner figures she has probably worn the dress 20 times since.

Ruth Sherlock modeled her grandmother's dress of black Georgette accented with black jet beads circa 1922-24. "I put it away as a keepsake," she said as the reason for holding on to it.

To accessorize the dress, Sherlock chose rhinestone earrings, the very same same earrings which were featured on a cover of Vogue magazine in the early 1950's. The Paris original was purchased from J.L. Hudson's for about \$80.

Storage tips for care of your prom dress

If you are thinking about preserving your dress as a keepsake, it's pretty easy.

"Dry cleaning is really enough," Vickie Kerrigan, owner of MainCentre Cleaners said. "Make sure they are cleaned to get the spots out of them because the spots will get darker over time."

Don't store the dress in plastic, she advised. Dry clean the dress and fold it with white tissue in between the folds and put the dress in a box. There is also special tissue available at dry cleaners.

"Store in a dry place, not the attic or the basement," Kerrigan said.

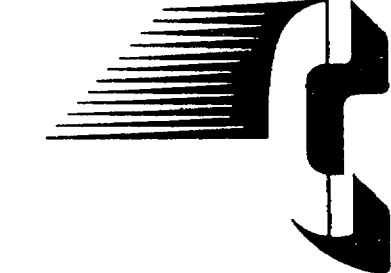

Fencing keeps student at her best

As if graduating from high school wasn't enough to keep a young lady busy, Katherine Smith, traveled to Louisville, Ky. over the weekend and ended up placing 13th in the Under 19 Division and 64th in the Women's Division at the National Competition this past weekend.

"I hadn't practiced in about three weeks because of school so I was a little out of shape and didn't finish as well as I had hoped," she said.

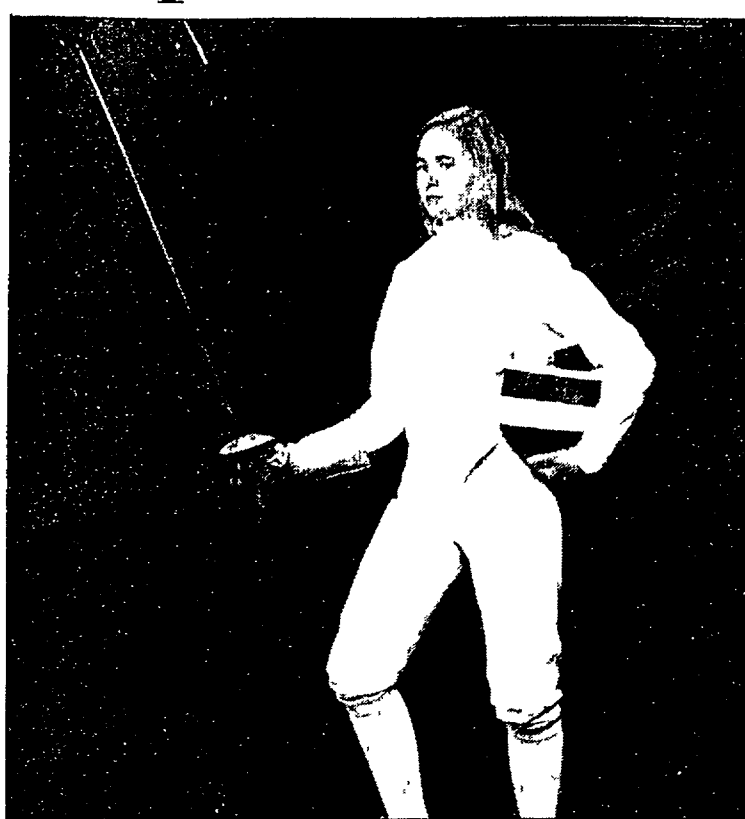
Smith began fencing when she was a freshman at Northville High School. She plans to join the fencing club at Carleton College in Minnesota, where she will be a freshman in the fall.

Smith's interest in fencing began as a child. She often watched old movies with stars such as Earl Flynn and Douglas Fairbanks which included fencing scenes. But what sent her over the edge and gave her the impetus to go for it was the movie *Princess Bride*.

In 1990 Smith began taking fencing lessons once a week at Schoolcraft Community College Fencing Club starting with foil, one of three weapons used in the sport.

In foil, the attacker hits with the point in the target area, which is the torso of the body of the opponent. Another point weapon, epee, has as the target area, the whole body.

Smith has been fencing saber, a slashing weapon, for one and a half years now. Using the saber, the attacker can hit with both the

edge and the point in the target area which is from the waist up and includes the waist and arms.

Her coaches, Doug McLaren and Dale Walters describe fencing as "chess at 90 miles an hour."

"Because you have to think strategy while you're moving," Smith explained.

In a fencing bout, a player must hit the opponent five times in the target area.

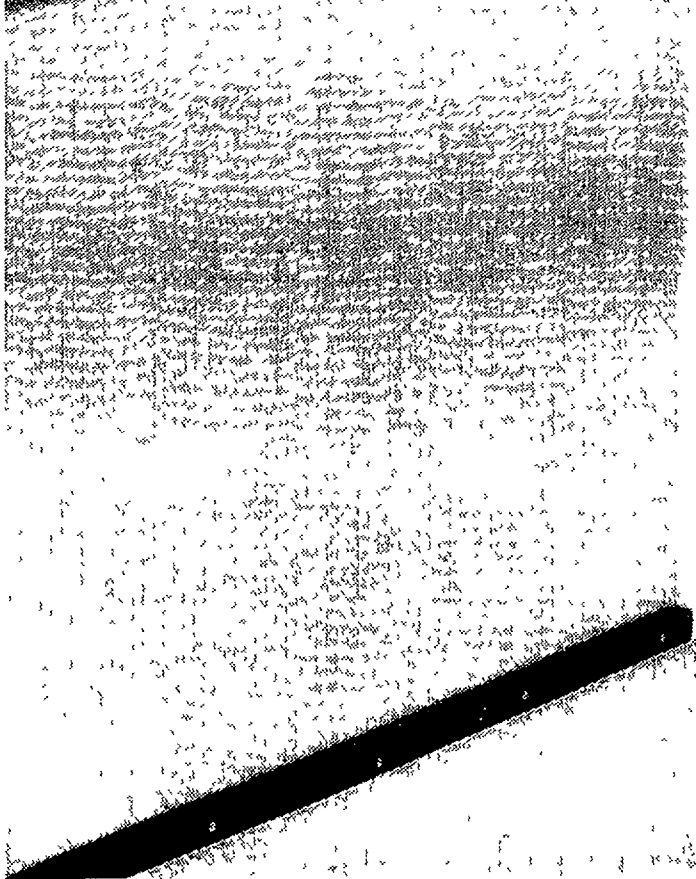
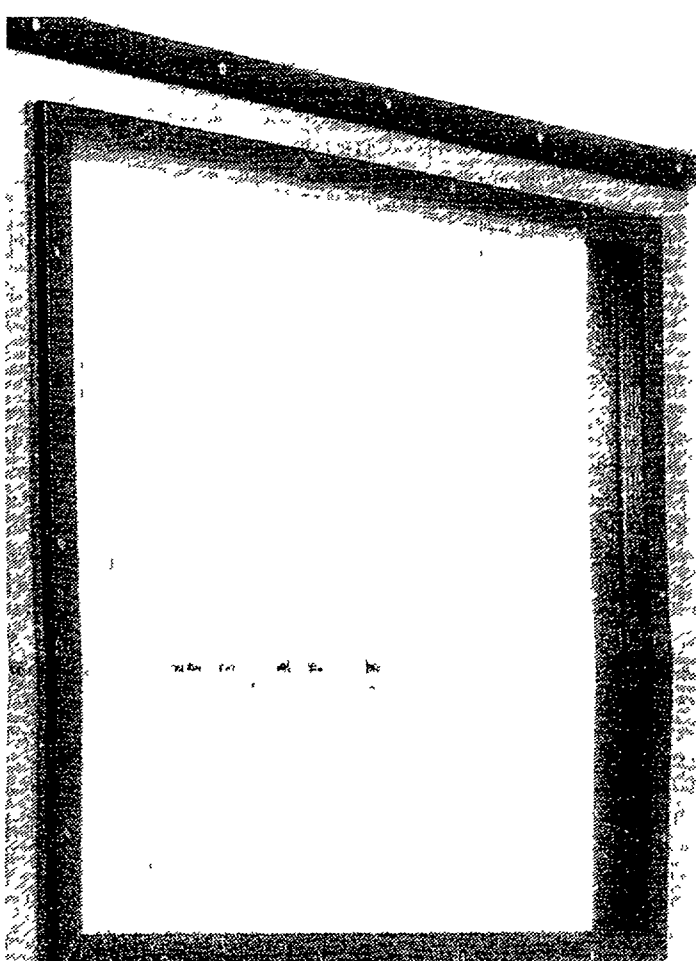
Players fence on a mat 14 meters long and 2 meters wide which hooked up to an electric box which turns on a light and sets off a buzzer when a hit has occurred.

"It's such a skill sport," Smith said. "You have to incorporate all of your talents to do well in a bout. Tactics and thinking quickly keeps you really well in shape because you're using every muscle in your body because you're always moving."

To stay in shape, Smith lifts weights and has fashioned a dummy opponent from a metal pole wrapped in pillows, complete with a mask on whom she can practice footwork and drills at home.

In February Smith competed at the Junior Olympics in San Jose, Calif. and finished 13th in the under-20 women's saber among a field of 2,000 young fencers who attended from throughout the country. She has many other competitions under her belt, including a second place Michigan qualifier in the National Women's Division I and a first place in the Michigan Junior Olympics Qualifiers for Women's Under 20.

Smith has also managed to stay very active in high school and was on the National Honor Society in the 11th and 12th grades, won awards for writing and was co-editor and editor-in-chief of the year book, received varsity letters and won awards in forensics, held leadership roles and won awards in the Girl Scouts.

Other factors made it a good year, too.



Take the leadership of senior captains Adrienne Browne, Jenny

Protect your children from skin cancer

Although skin cancer occurs in adults, it is caused by the sun exposure and sunburns that occurred during childhood. Every time you protect your child from too much sun exposure, you are helping to prevent skin cancer.

Apply sunscreen any time your child is going to be outdoors for more than 30 minutes. Give special attention to the areas most likely to become sunburned, such as the nose, ears, cheeks and shoulders. Set a good example and apply sunscreen to your own skin as well.

About 15 percent of white children have skin that never tans, only burns. These fair-skinned children need to be extremely careful about sun exposure throughout their lives. If a child has red or blond hair, blue or green eyes or freckles, he or she is at an increased risk for sunburn or skin cancer. These children need to use a sunscreen throughout the summer and avoid the sun whenever possible.

The skin of infants is thinner than the skin of older children and more sensitive to the sun. Sunscreens - preferably sun block - brimmed hats, and pants and long-sleeved shirts are essential. Don't put sunscreen on areas where

the infant may lick it off. Also, don't use sunscreens containing PABA on infants less than six months old without first talking with your doctor.

Meanwhile, protect your child's eyes from the sun's rays. Years of exposure to ultraviolet light increases the risk of cataracts. Buy them sunglasses with UV protection.

To prevent sunburned lips, apply a lip coating that contains PABA. If the nose or other area has been repeatedly burned, protect it completely from the sun's rays with zinc oxide ointment.

Avoid exposure to the sun between 10 a.m. to 3 p.m., when the sun's rays are most intense. Don't let overcast days give you a false sense of security. More than 70 percent of the sun's rays still get through the clouds. More than 30 percent of the sun's rays can also penetrate loosely woven fabrics such as cotton or gauze tops.

If your child becomes sunburned, aspirin or ibuprofen products started early and continued for two days can reduce the discomfort. Non-prescription 1-percent hydrocortisone cream or

moisturizing creams applied three times a day for two days may also reduce swelling and pain, but only if used soon after your child was sunburned. Symptoms can also be alleviated by taking cool baths.

Your child should drink extra water to replace the fluid lost into the swelling of sunburned skin and to prevent dehydration and dizziness.

Call your doctor's office immediately if your child:

- Develops blisters.
- Becomes unable to look at lights because of eye pain.
- Has an unexplained fever about 102 degrees F (38 degrees C).
- Has a sunburn that becomes infected.
- Starts acting very sick.

Battle rages over FHA

A battle is raging in the real estate and mortgage lending fields. It involves the Federal Housing Administration and its function of helping nearly 1 million families each year to purchase a home.

On one side are politicians and bureaucrats who want to restructure the system. On the other side are mortgage lenders, loan brokers and Realtors who want to keep the FHA program the way it is, helping a variety of people — particularly first-time buyers — own a home.

Background: The FHA was created in 1934 to increase homeownership opportunities for all Americans. As part of its original charter, the FHA was charged with guaranteeing loans on single-fami-

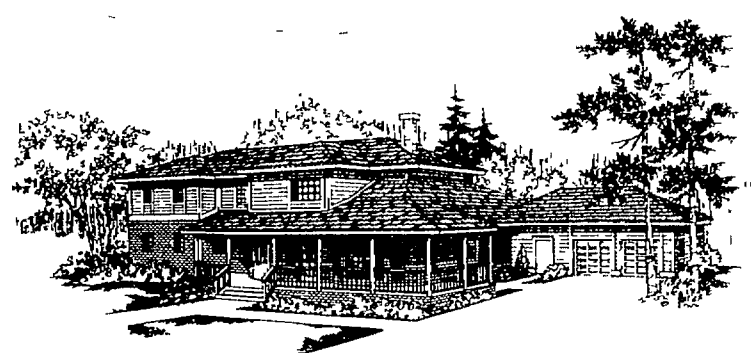
ly homes.

Qualified borrowers pay the FHA a premium in return for mortgage insurance. The premium revenue is deposited in the Mutual Mortgage Insurance Fund used to finance the program's operation and costs, including losses on any defaults on FHA loans.

Home buyers can pay smaller down payments when using an FHA loan to finance a home purchase, compared with a conventional home loan. It also allows borrowers to finance both closing costs and the mortgage insurance premium. And FHA allows borrowers to use gifts from others for the entire down payment — often an important factor for first-time buyers.

The Schram offers plenty of room for growing families

Open spaces and plenty of room are available for growing families in the sprawling 2,886-square-foot, two-story Schram. From the wrap-around front porch to the unfinished basement, this is a home that allows you to decide how the space is to be used.

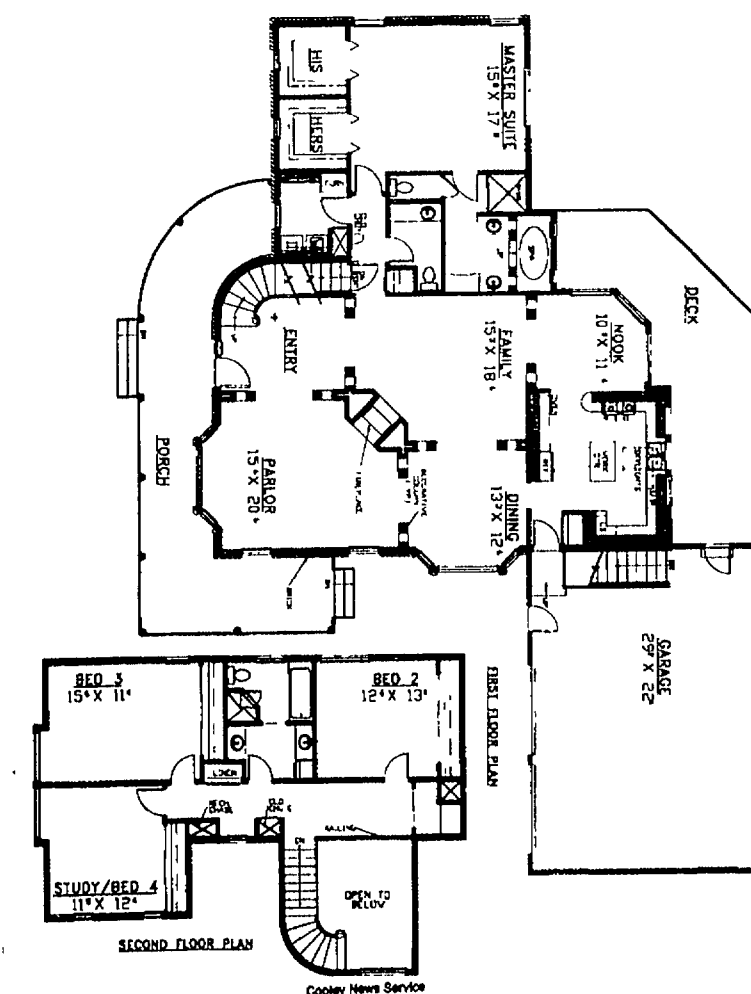
One of the popular features of

Radon can cause woe for homeowners

There's a long list of potential cancer-causers out there: the sun, cigarettes, too much of some foods, too few fruits and vegetables, too much alcohol...the list goes on.

And you can add another one to it — the house you live in.

For roughly the last decade, radon gas that seeps into homes has been recognized as a tangible threat. It's the second-leading cause of lung cancer in America (after smoking), and claims up to 14,000 lives every year.

What makes it even more pernicious is that you can't see it, smell it or taste it. You can live for years in a house being exposed to high levels of radon every day and never know it.

"It's just like the asbestos scare," said Dianne McCormick, director of environmental health for Livingston County. "But radon is totally different. The EPA (Environmental Protection Agency) has done study after study about it. It's a real threat that can be easily detected."

Radon levels vary from area to area and state to state, according to McCormick. She said there hasn't been a rash of radon problems in Livingston County, but the most troublesome area for radon is in the southeast

portion of Livingston, around South Lyon. This is due to the elevation of the ground and the geological make-up of the soil. Because of this, there have been higher levels of radon detected in homes in neighboring Washtenaw County, she said.

"I can't say we've had really high levels here in Livingston County," McCormick said. "It's hit and miss. It depends on the home. There have been homes where they've had acceptable levels of radon, and their neighbor's have had high levels. You never know."

Radon is a radioactive gas produced through the natural breakdown of radium and uranium in soil, rocks and water, and typically moves into homes through cracks in the foundation, or through well water. It is estimated that one in 15 homes throughout the country have high radon levels.

These numbers could taper off as time goes on, because radon testing is being used by some Real-

tors and lenders as a mandatory condition of closing a deal on a home. Many home builders are also making radon-resistant homes, where a plastic lining is installed when pouring a foundation. This acts as a barrier to prevent the entry of radon.

There are two types of tests that can be used to detect radon in the home — one is a short-term test that picks up radon levels over a few days, commonly using charcoal canisters, electret ion detectors and alpha track detectors. Long-term tests can take up to a year.

A Livingston County firm, Radon Testing and Reduction Systems, has test kits and can carry out tests at homes. Experts say the best time to test a home is winter, and a test should be carried out at the lowest level of a structure.

A home should be fixed if the radon level hits or surpasses four picocuries per liter. Radon levels that fall short of that mark can still pose threats and can be reduced. The highest level of radon detected in any home in Livingston County was 49 picocuries per liter, according to Chris Coffey of Radon Testing and Reduction Systems.

It's a relatively inexpensive proposition to repair a home that has high levels of radon. The high end runs around \$1,200, with costs running as low as \$20, McCormick said.



Poor soil is common ground across U.S.

Each gardening community across America has its own microclimate — arid or tropical (about every 50 miles), sunny or overcast, hot or cold. And all gardeners deal with their own climates in different ways. Remember the golden rule: You must garden for the area you live in.

However, there are some elements in a garden that are similar across the country. The most common is poor soil quality. According to the National Atlas of Soils, Soil Conservation Service, the United States is split into two major soil types: clay and sandy. These soils generally are topped with a thin layer of loamy soil that promotes plant growth and healthy root systems.

However, in many areas across the country, erosion, urbanization, new home construction and other factors are wearing away the topsoil, exposing clay and sandy soils, and causing a decline in plant health.

To solve this problem, adding organic matter, such as peat moss, is one way to help break up clay soil and

bind sandy soil. Mixing peat moss and well-rotted compost is another technique to condition the soil and add nutrients — a perfect combination for proper growth.

The National Atlas of Soils details individual states and regions. Here are some in brief to give you an idea: The majority of land in the United States is composed of clay/loamy soils. These soil types need the addition of organic matter to allow for better drainage and moisture retention.

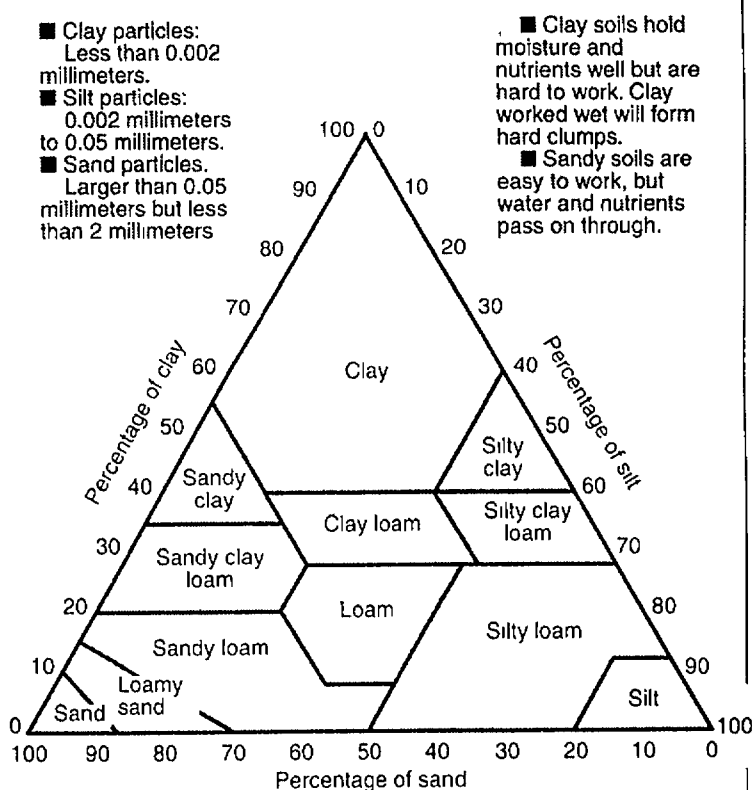
Some Southwestern regions are made up of sandy soils with very little silt and organic matter. These areas are dry and need plenty of organic matter to help retain moisture and nutrients.

Eastern regions feature rocky, clay soils, which repel water and prevent plant roots from growing. These areas need long-term soil conditioning with organic matter, grit and sand to improve soil structure.

Conditioning the soil with organic matter provides water

Soil texture

Soil experts use the following chart to define soil classes by gauging the relative percentages of clay, silt and sand. An extreme of any of the three is bad, with a combination near the center being good.

Black Americana encompasses wide range of collectibles



One of many collectibles depicting stereotypical black Americans in the late 1800s to the mid-1900s, this Mammy bank is valued between \$100 and \$125.

Q. Enclosed is a picture of a "Mammy" cast-iron bank. She is about 6 inches tall and in good condition. Coins are deposited into an opening in the back.

Can you give me an estimated value of my bank?

A. Black Americana encompasses a wide range of collectibles from art and literature to derogatory caricatures. Unflattering stereotypes were reflected in advertising and toys from the late 1800s to the mid-1900s. By the 1950s this prevailing attitude was changing.

The female image was known as Mammy or Aunt Jemima, and her male companion was called Uncle Mose.

Your Mammy bank is highly collectible. It would probably be worth about \$100 to \$125.

Q. My mother left me a porcelain figurine of a woman playing the piano. Leaning over her shoulder is a male figure. They are dressed in 18th century clothes. The base is ornate and trimmed in gold. It is marked with a crown and the letter "S," and the words "Made in Germany."

Could you tell me who made it and what it is worth?

A. Your figurine was made by the Sitzendorf Porcelain Manufactory, Sitzendorf, Thuringia, Germany, in the early 1900s. Its value would probably be about \$850 to \$1,200 in good condition.

Q. I hope you can help me. I have eight creamware plates that belonged to my mother. They are marked "Etruria — Wedgwood of Etruria & Barlaston — Made in England."

Could you please tell me the age and value of my plates?

A. Your plates were made by Josiah Wedgwood & Sons Ltd. This mark was used on pottery and creamware from 1940 to the present.

Wedgwood creamware was made from Cornwall clay, which has a strong light-color body.

The creamware factory was moved from Etruria to Barlaston around 1940. Each plate would probably be worth about \$50 to \$60 in good condition.

Q. I have a Rookwood vase with a matte blue-green glaze. It stands about 6 inches high and is decorated with an incised plume pattern. On the bottom is the Rookwood flame mark and the Roman numeral "XXII" and the numbers "1904."

I would like to sell my vase, but don't have a clue what to ask. Any help you can give me will be appreciated.

A. Rookwood art pottery was founded by Marie Longworth Nicholas Storer in Cincinnati, Ohio, in 1880. Rookwood

was the name of her family home.

The Roman numeral under the flame mark shows that your vase was made in 1922. The number "1904" is the model number and represents the "Feather" pattern.

The value of your vase would probably be about \$250 to \$350.

Q. My aunt gave me a cast-iron nutcracker that is over 100 years old. It is in the shape of a dog's head. When the nut is placed in the dog's mouth and a lever is pulled, the shell is cracked.

What can you tell me about my nutcracker, and does it have any value?

A. They might be able to build a better mousetrap, but 20th century technology hasn't been able to design a better nutcracker. They have been around since at least the 1700s.

Some of the more popular motifs were animals and soldiers. Most were made of cast iron or brass.

The vintage of your nutcracker is the late 18th century. It would probably be worth about \$65 to \$85.

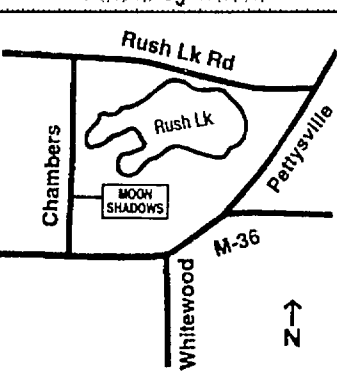

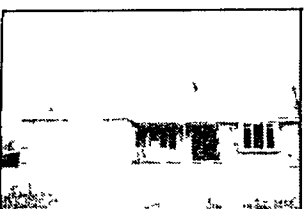
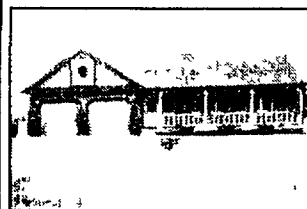

Removing stains from real marble

Q. I read your recommendations on cleaning synthetic marble stains. Do you also have some tips on cleaning stains from real marble? I have a marble coffee table that has collected ringed stains from glasses and several other spots that I have been unable to remove with general marble cleaners.

A. The first step is to give the surface a thorough cleaning. Flood with hot water, then scrub with a hot, sudsy, nonabrasive detergent, using a soft fiber brush or nylon scrubbing pad. Rinse well and buff dry with a soft, clean rag.

Removal of stains embedded in the surface will require a poultice. A poultice can be made of white blotting paper, white paper napkins, white cleansing tissue, commercial whitening, or powdered household cleanser.

The poultice is a thick paste soaked in the proper solution (depending on the type of stain) and kept from drying out while it is on the marble.

It can be covered with a piece of glass or a sheet of plastic, which will keep the moisture from evaporating while the stain is being

drawn out of the marble.

This process may take from one to 48 hours, depending upon the stain. Some substances will both etch and stain the marble, while others will etch the finish but not leave a stain.

Different types of stains require a different formula for the poultice. Organic stains are caused by such substances as tea, coffee, wet bark, flowers and leached colors from paper or textiles. These usually take the shape of the staining object and will often disappear without treatment after the staining substance has been removed.

To remove organic stains, wash the surface with clean water and apply a poultice soaked with hydrogen peroxide (20 volume) or household ammonia (full commercial strength).

For oil stains, those caused by butter, milk, salad oils, peanut butter, mustard, hand cream, etc., use a poultice soaked in amyl acetate or acetone.

Rust stains are orange to brown in color and follow the shape of the staining object. These are caused by steel wool, flower pots, some soils, nails, cans, etc. Use a poultice soaked in commercial iron rust remover.

HERE'S HOW

Once the stains have been removed, wet the surface with clear water and sprinkle on polishing powder (tin oxide, available from hardware stores or local marble shops). Wet the surface and polish briskly with the tin oxide powder on a pad of soft cloth.

A buffing pad with a power drill also can be used. Keep the marble wet and the pad moving. Apply water as often as needed to maintain a wet surface. Continue buffing until etch marks disappear and the marble surface shines.

When complete, dry with a soft cloth. You can apply a protective coating of a non-yellowing wax that will help maintain the sheen.

If the etch marks persist, con-

sult with a marble dealer. Your marble can be professionally polished and sealed if you are unable to remove etch marks and staining.

Instead of making your own poultice, you may want to try one of the commercial products available through a marble dealer. Several firms produce a complete line of marble cleaners, including a standard poultice, a cleaner and a sealer. A word of caution: These cleaning methods are for marble, not synthetic imitations.

Q. I clip your columns to keep for reference. Somehow I have misplaced a home remedy you recommended for cleaning sterling silver. Can supply me with this information?

A. There are a number of good

commercial products on the market. However, this simple home method is effective and easy.

Take an old aluminum pot or pan large enough to contain the silverware you want to polish. Add a tablespoon of salt and about the same amount of baking soda. Fill it with enough hot water to cover the cutlery. This creates an electrolytic solution.

Allow the silver to soak overnight. The black tarnish is an oxide that prefers aluminum to silver, so it migrates through the salt-soda solution to the aluminum.

The side of the silver closest to the aluminum cleans fastest, and you might have to repeat the process with the silver turned over. But that's about the hardest thing

you will have to do. Be sure and hot-water rinse the silver and dry with a soft clean towel after it is removed from this solution.

Q. When using silicone caulk, I was careless and now have several areas from which the dried caulking should be removed. Do you have any recommendations?

A. The most common solvent for silicone caulk is isopropyl alcohol. If that doesn't do the job, try a stronger solvent such as a paint thinner that contains xylene.

Restructuring the FHA

For 60 years, the program has worked well for home buyers, and has never required taxpayer money. In fact, it contributes about \$1 million annually in revenue to the federal Treasury, according to a study by the Mortgage Bankers Association. The revenue is generated from premium reserves and the secondary securities market.

The current proposal, being considered by Congress, would employ a principle called "targeting." FHA would be restricted to insuring only the neediest home buyers, or to provide less than 100 percent insurance.

"The scheme would give private mortgage insurers the choicest home mortgages and save the scraps for the FHA," said an MBA representative.

"The problem with this theory is that it won't work. Like any successful insurance company, FHA became self-sufficient by spreading risk across a broad spectrum of borrowers. Risk-spreading allows the program to offer reasonable premiums and to remain financially sound."

"Forcing FHA to insure only the neediest borrowers is like forcing a health insurance company to insure only cancer patients," the representative said. "In short order the program would either have to raise premiums to unaffordable levels or ask the government for subsidies."

MBA estimates that without FHA, 340,000 families a year — 40 percent of the total served — would be unable to buy a starter home.

Q. Is it possible that home mortgage interest could soon cease to be deductible on our income tax returns?

A. That's another key proposal on the table for certain politicians. The Senate Finance Committee, under the chairmanship of Bob Packwood, is considering eliminating the deductibility of interest on mortgages exceeding \$250,000 for both principal and second homes. That's a 75 percent cut in the current \$1 million ceiling.

In less than a decade, Congress has approved two limits on the deduction, it was noted in a recent

report from the National Association of Realtors. "Its history of action on taxes suggests that a third limit of this magnitude would be a big step down the slippery slope toward eventual elimination of the deduction," the report stated.

Q. Are condo sales continuing to increase?

A. No. The sale of condominium homes and cooperatives have fallen far below the level of a year ago. The sluggish market seems to be the result of concerns about job security, waning consumer confidence and periodic increases in mortgage interest rates.

As for pricing trends, the national median price for existing condos during the first quarter of this year fell 1.5 percent to \$85,700, according to an NAR report. The median price for condos was 20 percent below the \$107,600 median price for single-family homes during the same period.

Q. How serious is the current dip in home construction?

A. The slump in single-family construction in this country is the broadest and deepest decline in the past four years, according to a study by Lomas Mortgage USA. Demand for new homes has weakened in nearly all major metro markets. Builders have delayed construction schedules to prevent an inventory glut.

In the first quarter of this year, homebuilders ducked for cover even in some of the country's hottest single-family home markets, a Lomas report stated.

Nationally, single-family home building permits fell nearly 13 percent during the first quarter of this year, compared with the same period last year.

Regionally, permits dropped 21 percent in the Plains states, 12 percent in southeastern states, 11 percent in the Great Lakes region and 7 percent in the Oil Patch.

and nutrient-holding abilities, allows air into the soil and helps prevent soil compaction.

PROBLEM SOIL

Loam soil has a good mixture of organic matter and is generally black in appearance. However, the Department of Agriculture, Soil Conservation Service recommends an annual replenishment of organic materials, such as sphagnum peat moss, well-rotted leaves and manure and compost.

Sandy soil does not retain water and nutrients and makes poor areas for general planting. So amending with peat moss and other organic materials will help hold moisture and nutrients.

Clay soil generally needs more amending than any other soil group because it repels both moisture and nutrients. Work in plenty of peat moss and other organic materials into the top 6 inches of soil before planting trees, shrubs or garden beds.

In a novel approach to recycling, the Raleigh, N.C., News and Observer has been offering its back issues as mulch. Here's how it works:

They collect subscribers' used

papers, then return them shredded and baled to local gardeners, or to anyone else who's interested for \$1 per bale.

The program saves space at local landfills and that saves the city money.

So far, the project is not making money, but it's on the way. Last year, the program took in about \$40,000 but spent \$200,000 to expand. Eventually they hope to break even.

The News and Observer recently opened a new recycling center and expects to redistribute 14 percent of its total newsprint consumption this year.

What a great project for your city or town!

Auto Physical

So, you think you're a conscientious car owner. You take your car in for its dealer-recommended services every several thousand miles — if you remember. You change the oil every 3,000 miles and even check the air pressure in your tires every — well, when you remember. Ok, at least you wash the car every now and again, right? If you're feeling guilty, don't worry. You're not alone.

Statistics show that cars are under-repaired and under-maintained, and it not only means car owners risk serious car trouble, but it can cost big bucks at trade-in time, too.

Research by the American Automobile Association shows that of 114,000 cars inspected over an eight-year period, 43 percent had worn or underinflated tires, 30 percent had worn or misadjusted belts, 30 percent were overdue for an oil change or were low on oil, 26 percent had emissions problems and 21 percent needed battery maintenance.

The danger is that lack of preventive maintenance often results in far greater problems needing expensive repairs that could have been avoided with a little more attention.

Consider your car as an extension of your body that, like your body, needs an annual physical, as well as regular care. If you didn't brush your teeth you'd expect to eventually end up in the dentist's chair for a drilling, right? So car maintenance should be common sense. After the hard driving vehicles endure during winter, spring is the perfect time to check that everything under the

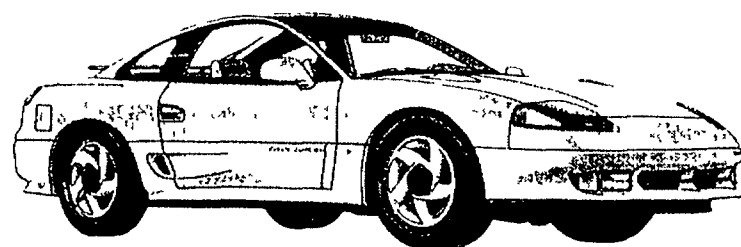

Prepare your car for the warm months ahead

hood is in working order.

The Car Care Council recommends having brakes inspected, without fail, annually, regardless of whether or not you suspect a brake problem. And because many cars today have complex breaking systems with more than 150 working parts, or computerized anti-lock systems, it's recommended that you leave a brake inspection up to professionals.

Even so, learn brake inspection lingo so you know you are getting good service. The council explains that a close inspection should include examining pads and shoes for lining ware, all wheel cylinders, calipers, drums and rotors, all hardware, brake lines and hoses for leaks, kinks or blockage, and

inspection of brake fluid levels. If all four wheels are not removed, it's a warning your brakes are not getting a thorough and full inspection.

Another item to check on your car's spring physical is the battery. The council reports that whereas a dead battery is most often blamed for a car not starting, it is usually only corroded battery connections that are to blame. The symptoms are the same—a groaning or click-click when the ignition key is turned.

The key to avoiding battery problems is to occasionally remove and clean the battery terminals. Remember when replacing a battery to purchase the new one from a reputable dealer licensed to discard of the old battery according to current laws.

Your vehicle's air-conditioning system is also a component strictly controlled by law. Part of the Clean Air Act is to protect the Earth's ozone layer from chlorofluorocarbons, called CFCs, a chemical compound that includes the Freon used in most air-conditioning systems. Only licensed professionals are allowed to purchase and recycle Freon refrigerant systems, which means air-conditioning service, maintenance and repairs should never be attempted by a car owner.

Professionals use complex air-conditioning servicing equipment that changes to keep up with the laws, which inevitably means servicing doesn't come cheap. But it's a must for keeping your cool in the car during the summer months and keeping the atmosphere CFC-free.

Something car owners can do themselves with a little know-how is change the oil and air filter. Manufacturers recommend that oil be changed and the air filter checked every 3,000 miles, and top up with a good all-weather oil when needed. Because increased summer temperatures punish rubber components, spring is a good time to check hoses and belts for cracks and general wear and tear. The Shell Motorist Club recommends replacing all hoses and belts every three years, even if they show no wear.

Fluid levels should be checked frequently, including brake and power steering fluids. Now is also a good time to flush the radiator and add fresh coolant in preparation for warmer weather. And, of course, don't forget to replace windshield washer fluid.

Instead of waiting for your noisy wipers to smear the windshield during a downpour, good weather is the best time to replace wipers. The Car Care

Council reports that wipers are the most frequently replaced item on a car, so be sure to get the right size and type for your vehicle.

Take your old wipers to the store, because sizes range from 15 to 22 inches and blade assembly connectors vary from car to car and brand to brand.

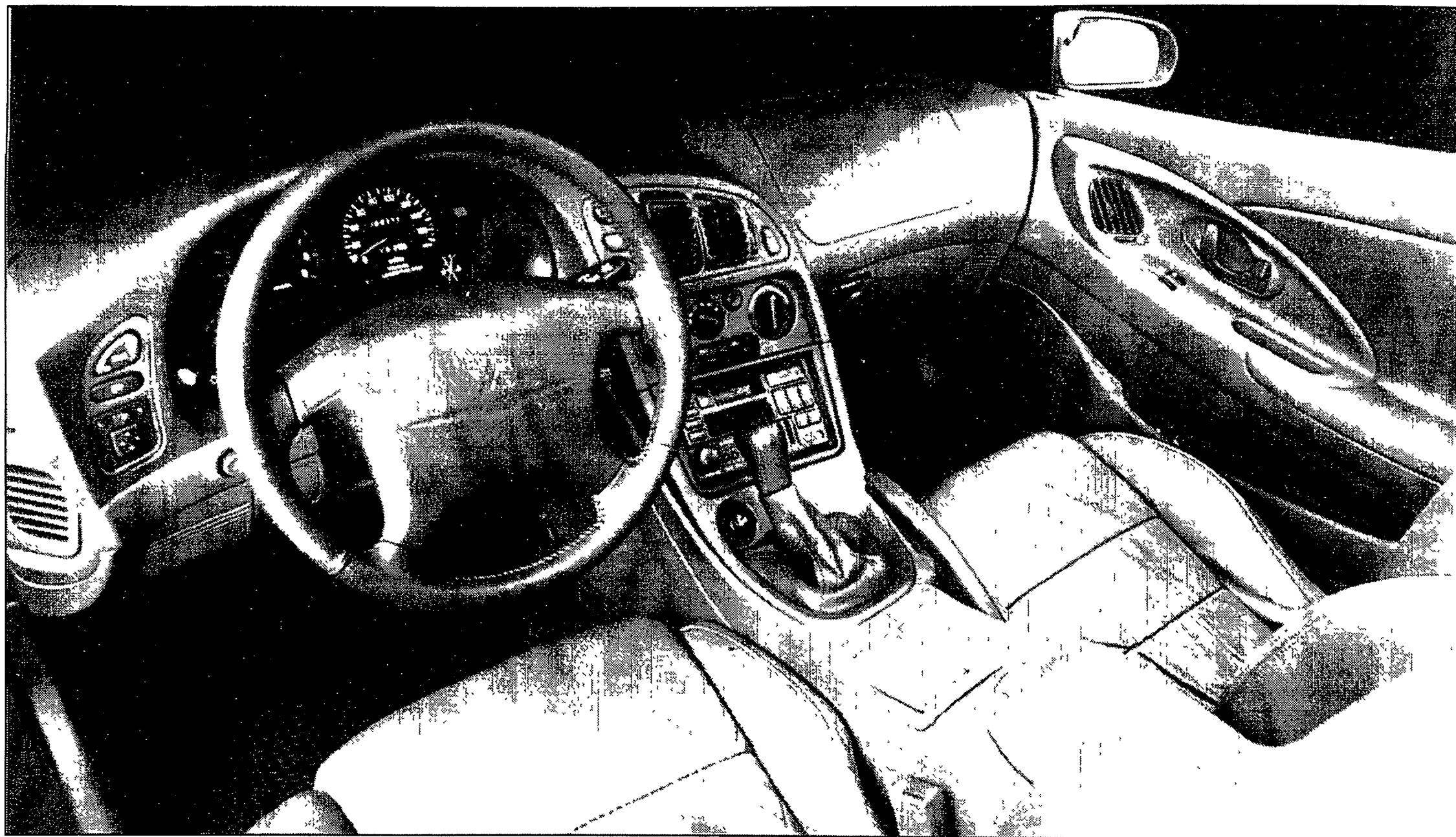
Annual spring car care also should include a good spring cleaning. Beyond a basic wash and wax having your car 'detailed' means the metal is shined, the interior is shampooed, air vents are dusted and professional detailers may even go so far as to clean audio equipment and instrument panels with a cotton swab.

If you use the many cleaning and polishing products available for home car detailing, you are adding to your investment in a car. The council reports that the average price of a car today is \$18,000 and that a well-maintained car in "detail shape" can be worth twice as much at trade-in time.

Consumers clamor for safety and luxury

Cars have come a long way since Ford's black Model-T. Today's are sleeker, computerized, pricier and safer.

And safety is evidently the greatest concern among car buyers today.

Five years ago, the concept of selling safety was deadly dull to most car manufacturers.

But carmakers have finally realized something we've been telling them for years — consumers do care about safety. And now that they have caught on, nearly every auto ad mentions some aspect of safety," says Jack Gillis in "The Car Book" (Harper Perennial/HarperCollins).

Safety features are the greatest trend among cars today, and probably for the foreseeable future. But there also are trends toward luxury, comfort and style. Let's see what new automotive features are available today, soon and someday.

SAFETY TRENDS

The two biggest trends in auto safety during the late 1990s — we're not quite there yet — will be side-impact air bags and daytime running lights.

The automobile industry, in cooperation with the federal government, 20 years ago, developed two basic forms of automatic crash protection, according to Gillis, air bags and automatic safety

belts.

These devices will not prevent all deaths, but they will cut in half your chances of being killed or seriously injured in a car accident," says Gillis.

Today's vehicles typically carry as standard equipment a driver's-side air bag and are more frequently adding a passenger-side air bag as standard. Even if the passenger-side air bag is optional, get it.

Don't buy cars without dual air bags," states Gillis, flatly. Most cars will likely be required to have dual air bags within a few years.

However, this is still not true on the fastest-growing segment of vehicle types, minivans, pickups and sport utility vehicles.

For the first time, minivans, pickups and sport utility vehicles will be required to provide roofs strong enough to support the vehicle's weight if it rolls over, and contain reinforcement beams in the doors to protect occupants in side crashes," says Gillis.

However, these vehicles are not yet required to provide any automatic crash protection, in the form of either automatic belts or air bags. Automatic crash protection requirements will be phased in beginning this year, but will not become standard until 1998."

Some sport utility vehicles do offer dual air bags in current models, howev-

er.

Automatic safety belts are motorized versions that move into place when you open and close the door. Unfortunately, these automatic systems do only half the job. You must manually attach the separate lap belt, which is crucial in avoiding severe accident injury.

Side-impact air bags are the wave of the future. The Volvo 850 is the first to have them on the market, but they are likely to be included in many more models soon. These air bags are attached to the seats or doors, and inflate when a car is hit on its side.

In fact, by 1997, federal guidelines will require more side-impact protection in the form of energy-absorbing foam and air bags.

Other good safety features to look for include roll bars in the roof and doors as well as extensive padding throughout the dash and knee areas.

Many automakers today are also including built-in child safety seats, which is an excellent feature for parents "because the seat is always in the car," says Gillis.

Daytime running lights are already required in Canada, though not yet in the United States. General Motors will be the first automaker in the United States to equip vehicles with DRLs starting in the fall; by 1997, GM will fit nearly all its vehicles with DRLs, according

to Road & Track magazine.

DRLs come on automatically when the vehicle is started and go off when the ignition is turned off or the headlights are turned on, according to an article in Road & Track. DRLs operate in all weather conditions, but are most effective in increasing visibility on overcast days, in rain and just before dawn and after sunset."

Anti-lock brakes or anti-locking braking systems are another important safety trend, today included as standard or optional on most new cars.

ABS is one of the best safety features available next to the air bag.

ABS shortens stopping distance on dry, wet and even icy roads... prevents wheel lock-up and keeps you from skidding out of control when you "slam" on the brakes or hit a slick spot," says Gillis.

Traction control and all-wheel drive are other new safety trends. Traction control, standard or optional on many new models, is a system that prevents drive wheels from spinning on a low-traction surface, according to "AAA Auto Test" (American Automobile Association).

"Controls prevent wheel spin by applying the brakes, slowing the engine power to the wheels or both."

All-wheel drive or four-wheel drive,

accounting for some of the vast popularity of the sport utility market, gives power to all four wheels to improve traction.

"Common on trucks and sport utility vehicles, some passenger cars and mini-vans also offer AWD," says AAA. Some AWD systems are full time, while others are part time, in which the four-wheel-drive system is engaged specifically when it's needed.

FEATURES FOR COMFORT

Without naming names, we share some of the interior design features on many of today's cars that should prove the standards to come.

Cruise control isn't new, but many cars now offer the controls as a stalk on the steering column. Here you'll also find multifunction controls for your stereo and even car phones — hands-free.

Speaking of stereos, many cars today offer built-in CD players as well as radios and cassettes, and the number of built-in speakers just keeps growing. 14 speakers make one car's interior a virtual concert hall.

And speaking of car phones, many

cars today have specific locations for them to be wired — or they can be purchased as an option.

Cup holders aren't the high-tech marvel that air bags are, but they sure make drinking coffee on the way to work less hazardous. Some cars today offer cup holders for the driver, passenger and two back-seat commuter companions.

Interior ventilation and air-conditioning/heating systems can now come in separate units, allowing the driver and the passenger to control their individual temperature desires.

On-board computers in many of today's cars can tell you what the temperature is outside, how many miles you're averaging to the gallon, how many miles you have left according to what's in the gas tank (especially useful for those who go until the last drop) and even the date and time.

Power windows and power mirrors are becoming far more standard today, but so are power door locks and even remote, keyless door locks — you've seen those fellow grocery shoppers who simply push a button to unlock and unlock their cars without having to put down those bags.

And some cars today offer visor-inter-

grated, programmable garage door openers.

WHAT THE FUTURE HOLDS

Three-door pickups? They're coming. According to Road & Track, the third door is a small one on the passenger side, behind the front door.

Because there is no back door on long-cab models now, to get behind the front seat you must move the front seat, as in a two-door car," says the magazine. Three-door designs are expected to hit the market in 1996.

Natural-gas automobiles and other energy-saving ideas will hit the market in the next few years.

And aluminum cars will make that energy-saving idea even easier.

The aluminum-intensive vehicle, or AIV, is an ongoing project at Ford, according to Road & Track. While cars use some aluminum today, most are constructed mainly of steel, which is twice as heavy as aluminum, but half as expensive.

If they can work out production, automakers will eventually turn out aluminum cars that are lighter and, as a result, faster and more fuel-efficient — but also probably more expensive.

According to Gillis' book, Dr. Carl Clark, one of the inventors of the air bag, envisions the following advancements:

Radial brakes: Using radar to detect objects in front of you, a warning sounds for the need to brake. It can also be used to automatically apply the brakes when a driver falls asleep, for example.

Air pads will be double layers of plastic with multiple compartments that inflate when crash sensors for air bags detect a crash, over all hard surfaces such as windowsills and windshield areas.

Night-vision enhancement will actually involve infrared light cameras that project visible images of what's ahead, even through fog, rain and darkness.

Navigation computers would make road maps obsolete. The Olds 88 has it in a 1995 model as a \$2,000 option.

The black-box monitor would detect whether the driver is driving drunk or otherwise irresponsibly by monitoring the car's behavior, and would shut the car down.

Perhaps carmakers will continue to note how the public responds to safety features and we'll see these enhancements before the year 2000.

Tread Trends

Inflation, inflation, inflation.

Checking the air in your car tires is to tire maintenance what location is to real estate.

"The air inside your tires carries the load of your vehicle and if it's not right, crazy and expensive things can go wrong," says Thomas Cole, chairman of the Tire Industry Safety Council.

In addition, he says, "keeping tires properly inflated to the vehicle manufacturer's recommended levels extends tread life and improves gas mileage significantly. Underinflated tires run hotter, wear faster and can add to a tire's rolling resistance, which means your engine and your tires have to work harder.

Unfortunately, simply checking the air is more than many car owners do. But there's more to proper tire care than just hot air if you want to keep your vehicle running safely and well.

Because maintaining proper tire inflation is the No. 1 most important issue in tire care, checking requires more than a cursory glance at the flatness of the tire and hosing in some air at a gas station when you think about it three months later. Cole recommends checking the air pressure at least once a month with an accurate gauge.

You can't tell with a visual inspection alone whether your tires are underinflated, Cole notes.

The best time to check the air pressure is when tires are "cold," i.e., driven less than a mile. The correct inflation pressure for your tires can usually be found on a sticker on your car door post or glove box door or in your owner's manual.

Cole recommends buying and using your own air pressure gauge as some air pressure towers at service stations are inaccurate due to exposure and abuse. While checking inflation, don't forget to check the spare tire so that it's ready to use if needed and take a look at the tread on your tires.

"Tires with less than one-sixteenth of an inch tread depth are considered bald and should be replaced," Cole explains.

When it's time to replace your tires, selecting the right tread is important, although with today's tire technology, there isn't too much to choose from.

This makes selection easy for consumers with little car maintenance knowledge.

"In today's market there's a preponderance of all-season tread tires," Cole explains. "The only real distinction is between all-season or the more traditional, heavier look mud and snow tire."

But for the average commuter, no matter whether you drive in rain or shine or both, tire safety technology today makes all-season the best way to go, especially as you don't have the expense or hassle of remembering to change your tires with the change of seasons.

When it comes to choosing the dealer from whom to buy tires, Cole says small dealers know as much, if not more, than the mass merchandisers. Most dealers, large and small, carry a wide variety of tire brand names and models, and most can be ordered for

quick delivery and mounting.

Once selected, treat your tire purchase as you would the purchase of any new appliance under warranty and insist on receiving tire registration information from the dealer. Tire registration is a very important and potentially life-saving process that is often overlooked.

It allows owners to be tracked in the event of a recall, although Cole says that in his 18 years with the Tire Industry Safety Council he has known only a handful of tire models to be recalled. But it's better to be safe than sorry, and take tire registration into your own hands.

While independent dealers and distributors are not required to register for you, "the law says the dealer is supposed to give you a registration card with the brand name, model and serial number on it for you to fill out and mail back to the manufacturer like any appliance card," Cole explains.

"But dealers often can't be bothered with tire registration," so it's up to the

customer to insist on receiving the paperwork and details. The tire identification number is molded on the tire sidewall, and many major retailers, such as Sears, provide automatic registration as a customer service.

If you purchase tires from a wholesale or discount store, the council warns never to mount or dismount tires yourself.

"Choosing the wrong size tire for your vehicle's rim can have tragic consequences," Cole emphasizes.

The mismatching of any of the components of a tire and rim assembly can cause the tire and/or rim to burst during inflation. Such an explosion could result in serious injury or even death.

In other words, seek the advice of professional tire outlets. Cole points out that qualified service personnel have the know-how, proper training, industry-approved service manuals and the specialized equipment necessary to install tires safely and efficiently. From there, proper tire maintenance of infla-

tion, rotation and alignment is up to the consumer.

Rotation requirements vary vehicle to vehicle, but the average recommendation between rotations is 5,000 to 7,000 miles. Uneven wear on tires can indicate alignment problems. Alignment is tougher to gauge and often not required unless you have an accident or hit a major pothole and knock something out of whack. Learn to listen to your car and, if it seems to be driving and steering differently, have it checked out.

The Tire Industry Safety Council offers a free 18-page booklet, Motorist's Tire Care & Safety Manual, which includes sections on proper tire inflation and inspection procedures, special safety warnings, tire rotation recommendations, how to extend the life of your tires and how to read a tire sidewall.
