the board come November. As no other names Democrat or Republican will appear on the Nov. 5 general election ballot for supervisor, Woodside is now all but assured of a victory in the fall.

Some candidate (see related story) like Woodside, Hillebrand and Henningsen face no ballot opposition in November. Abbo, Fogg, Gans and Selinsky, however, will battle with Democrat Shirley Klokenga in Nov. 5 for the four trustee slots.

The final call in the Woodside/Grant race came with the tabulation of the absentee vote, which was far larger than the number of people casting their ballots at the polls on Tuesday and included hundreds of write-in votes.

School district finalizes millage proposal language

Northville schools may finally be equipped with up-to-date computer technology and trained staff members to use it, if voters approve a millage for property taxes.

That's the date voters will be asked to approve a \$1.15 millage proposal for the construction of a new high school and renovation to existing facilities, according to school district officials.

The school board approved the ballot language for the 1.15 mill enhancement Monday. According

to District Supervisor Len Leon and Robert Jackowski, the request will bring \$1.2 million into the district. Jackowski said the funds will be used to support personnel costs that will aid in the implementation of district technology over a five-year period.

In order for the district to take advantage of the best use of all available enhancement millage, voter approval must be obtained before October.

The enhancement millage is a 10-mill levy, plus the state's 1.15 mill. Proposal A of 1994 which altered school funding. There is only one

year left on enhancement millage availability, and after this year additional millages could be put before voters if school districts representing a majority of students within Wayne County call for an election.

If approved, the 1.15 mills would cost a resident with a \$100,000 home an additional \$97.50 for one year. Someone with a \$200,000 house would be assessed an additional \$195.

District Finance Director John Strick reported that the state treasurer department recently approved the election date and bond appli-

Library move only weeks away

It's going to be kind of like when you were a kid waiting for your birthday to arrive. Remember how that was? The days leading up to it were tough sledding but in the end the pleasure was worth all the pain.

What are we talking about? The closing and opening of Northville's brand spanking new library that's

Northville is associated with The Library Network, a cooperative agreement among metro area libraries that allows the public to make use of their resources. Northville's library officials have already alerted network members about the closing.

Family of accident victim struggles through tears

The new fountain sits amidst some pine trees in the backyard of Robert and Pat Mudge, a slow stream of water trickling over the carefully placed rocks into a shallow pool. The muddy water, a stark contrast to the vibrant colors of the newly planted flowers that surround the fountain.

"Chris always loved the water," Robert Mudge said in a low, almost inaudible voice. His eyes fixed on the water running from one rock to the next. "He loved the water. He loved the pine trees and he just loved life. This is how I want to remember him."

A dead tree stump sat where the fountain now resides and Robert hadn't really found the time to remove it. That all changed last week when a Michigan State Police Trooper, riding the Mudge's doorman and informed the Northville couple that their 16-year-old son, Chris, would never come home again.

The popular youth lost his life when a Chevy Blazer driven by his

Northville grouped with Oakland in new area code

Northville may be mostly in Wayne County, but the city and much of the township will follow Oakland County when it comes to the new area code.

In May 1997, the 248 area code for the majority of Oakland County will be activated, as the 810 region is split.

Most Northville exchanges will have the 248 area code, Ameritech Public Relations Director Marcia Sayles said.

Northville telephone numbers to

come under the 248 area code are those which begin with these three digits: 344, 347, 348, 349, 360 and 449.

Many Novi numbers are also within the Northville exchange.

For four months, customers will have the option of dialing either 810 or 248 to reach these Oakland County and Northville numbers. From September 1997 on, callers will have to dial the correct area code for calls to go through.

In addition to Oakland County,

small areas of Washtenaw, Genesee and Lapeer and Macomb counties will fall within the 248 boundary.

However, a small portion of Northville Township, including Country Club Estates at Six Mile and Haggerty roads, will remain within the 313 area code with Wayne County.

Included are numbers within the Plymouth exchange, which begin with the three digits 420.

In June 1998, another new area

code will be on the books when Wayne County's 313 code splits. Detroit, the Grosse Pointes, Lincoln Park, Allen Park, Melvindale, Dearborn, Dearborn Heights, Redford, Taylor, River Rouge, Hamtramck and Harper Woods will keep 313.

The new, as yet undisclosed code will include the Plymouth exchange and other Wayne County locations.

A four-month grace period will again apply.

Sayles said dialing the new area codes will not impact rates. A local call will remain a local call, even if it requires punching a 1 and an area code before dialing.

Cellular phones, fax machines, computer modems and other high tech communication devices have led to the area code splits. In an effort to create more available telephone numbers.

Summer job seekers drive up state jobless rate

Unemployment rates in all but one of Michigan's 10 major labor markets climbed in June, as teenage summer jobseekers began entering the job market, according to seasonally unadjusted estimates prepared by the Michigan Employment Security Commission (MESC).

"The number of workers entering the job market in search of summer employment simply outpaced the number of available jobs, causing unemployment rates to increase in all major areas, except for the Upper Peninsula," MESC director F. Robert Edwards reported.

"The Flint area had the largest increase as its rate rose a full percentage point to 6.4 percent in June from 5.4 percent in May. The Grand Rapids, Lansing, Benton Harbor and Jackson areas also had significant increases, as their June jobless rates all grew by

more than half a percent."

The Detroit, Kalamazoo/Battle Creek, Saginaw/Bay/Midland and Ann Arbor areas had jobless rate increases either at or below half a percentage point.

The Upper Peninsula was the only area where unemployment dropped in June. Unemployment in the 15-county region dropped slightly, falling to 7.4 percent from 7.6 percent in May. Despite the increase the U.P. had the highest jobless rate for the month, while the Ann Arbor area had the lowest rate at 2.8 percent.

"Although most areas had increases in their jobless rates in June, they also had higher employment levels," Edwards noted. "But the job gains could not match the work force increases caused by young people entering the summer job market."

Among the industries reporting employment gains around the

state in June were construction, retail trade, real estate and business services.

"The private sector job gains were offset, however, by losses among state and local schools, where employment levels fell with the start of the summer recess period," Edwards said.

In the U.P., where unemployment dropped in June, job gains occurred in several industries, including retail trade and services

which climbed with increased tourism-related activity.

Over the year, every area but Benton Harbor had declines in their jobless rates from June 1995 to 1996.

Among Michigan's 83 counties, U.P. counties had the state's highest and lowest June jobless rates. Ontonagon had the highest rate at 17.4 percent, while Mackinac County led all counties with the lowest June rate at 2.2 percent.

Planning Briefs

News from the July 30 meeting of the Northville Township Planning Commission:

NEW MICKEY D'S ON THE WAY: McDonald's has received a green light from the commission to rebuild its existing restaurant on Five Mile east of Haggerty road, just inside the township's borders.

Commissioners approved the final site plan for the reconstruction, which will include fewer parking spaces and a children's play place.

NEW EATERIES PROPOSED: Two restaurants are slated to occupy outlet buildings in the under-construction Northville Village shopping center at Six Mile and Haggerty.

Papa Vito's Italian Kitchen and Don Pablo's Mexican Kitchen are proposed for two of the center's four outlet buildings. Commissioners had no major problems with Papa Vito's preliminary design but objected altogether to plans for Don Pablo's.

The architecture and design proposed for the restaurant, commissioners said, is not in keeping with the rest of the center and must be changed.

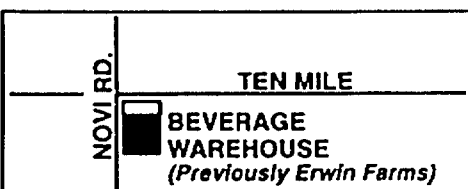
The plan is expected to return to the commission after modifications are made.

Coin cache taken from home

A Northville Township family lost a valuable cache of cash and jewelry during the weekend before last.

Sometime during the night of July 25-26 \$1,575 in quarters and dimes was taken from the family's Seven Mile home. Two \$50 bills were also stolen. The reporting party named a possible suspect to police, whom computer records show has a string of outstanding warrants out for his arrest.

COMPUTER SWIPED: A Northville business located on Six Mile was broken into for the third time in three months recently.

The manager told township police the burglary must have taken place at about 1:40 a.m. on July 28. Taken was a \$4,000 computer. Computer equipment was also taken in the two previous break-ins as well.

CAR STOLEN: Someone made off with a Mustang belonging to a Northville Place Drive man during the night of July 29-30.

The man, 30, said his 1987 automobile was parked in the parking lot when he went to bed but was gone the next morning. Novi police found the car on Aug. 1 in their city. Its license plate and sunroof missing but no other signs of damage.

CUT AND RUN: Meijer employees and police from four departments hunted for a shoplifting suspect who slipped away in the early morning hours of July 20.

Store detectives called township police at about 3:15 a.m. that day to report that they were chasing a man whom they said stole two fishing reels and a pair of blue jeans and was spotted running through Meijer's parking lot toward Haggerty Road.

Township officers, the Michigan State Police and police from Novi and Livonia converged on the area and tried to locate the man but were unsuccessful.

The items are valued at \$56.

VANDALISM AT SCHOOLS: Two Northville elementaries, Moraine

and Winchester, suffered broken windows at the hands of unknown vandals recently.

Five hundred dollars in damage was done to Moraine sometime between July 26-30. A bike rack was also pulled into the parking lot of the school and saw horses thrown onto its roof.

Winchester suffered \$300 in damage. The attack occurred during the night of Aug. 1.

ARREST: A Detroit man stopped for running a red light on Six Mile on July 30 was found to be wanted for probation violations, according to township police.

A computer check revealed the outstanding felony arrest warrant after the traffic stop of the man's 1975 Ford van. The man, 31, was taken into custody and held at police headquarters until a Wayne County Sheriff's Department deputy picked him up.

LOST & FOUND: A township man reported losing then finding his cellular phone on Aug. 1.

The man, 50, told police that someone must have taken his phone, valued at \$150, from his car while it was parked outside Rite-Aid Drugs on Seven Mile.

The 1995 Lincoln Continental was locked, the man said, but the moon roof was retracted and the phone was under the driver's seat.

The next day the man called police to report that he'd found the phone elsewhere in the vehicle.

WELCOME BACK: Home Depot got a blast from the past on July 31 as a man thought to have attempted to shoplift there a couple of months ago was back a second time for the same crime.

Store employees told police they stopped a man who was carrying out two mulching mowers and asked to see his receipt. The man then released the mowers, valued at \$712 each, and ran into a burgundy-colored Ford van parked outside the store.

The van then took off at a high speed onto Seven Mile. Employees say the man was in Home Depot a

couple of months ago, trying to walk out with air conditioners when he was stopped.

INVESTIGATION CONTINUES: Northville Police are continuing their search for a white male who allegedly exposed himself to two 13-year-old girls July 29.

According to police the girls were walking through the field in front of Cooke Middle School when a white male, dressed in a yellow shirt and black running shorts, yelled at the girls in an attempt to entice them to his location on Taft.

The girls were alarmed and immediately began running across Taft, and when they stopped to see if the man was following them, the man pulled down his shorts.

The girls ran to a nearby house and contacted police. They told officers they saw the man run into a nearby condominium complex.

Pair of suspects held in rash of auto thefts

Alert resident helps cops nab teens

Keep your eyes open and call the police if you see anything suspicious.

Those two simple rules led Northville Township police to nab two teens suspected of a string of car break-ins last week.

"We need people to be the eyes and ears of the police department," Detective Fred Yankee said. "We need them to help us so we can help them."

A township resident did just that on Saturday, Aug. 3. The resident called police at about 1:30 a.m. after seeing the two teens, both 17 and township residents, walking around in the parking lot of Park Place apartments.

Park Place is located near Eight Mile and Griswold Avenue

and has been the site of vehicle break-ins in the past, most recently two weeks ago. On the night of July 28-29 five separate cars were hit and a total of \$11,750 in merchandise was taken.

After the phone call, township officers checked the area and questioned the two boys. One was allegedly found to have a cellular phone on his person and a second cell phone, along with a CD player, shaver, radar detector and crack pipe was reportedly discovered in the youths' vehicle.

According to Yankee the youths were involved in the break-ins of three or four cars that night.

"We want people to call whenever they see something that doesn't look right. You know

your neighborhood better than anyone else so you know when something's not right," Yankee said.

"What we're saying is call us anytime," he continued. "If it turns out that a person is supposed to be there, no problem. What if it's something else, though?"

Police are seeking criminal warrants against each boy for larceny over \$100. That is a felony charge which carries a maximum sentence of five years in prison.

Yankee also said police have recovered property from several recent vehicle break-ins that remains unidentified and unclaimed.

Feline gets unwanted buzz cut

There may be more than one way to skin a cat, but pet owner John Bullington believes even one way is too many.

Bullington's cat, Minuette, spent the night away from home a few weeks ago, making it hard for her master to sleep restfully that night. When she showed up on the doorstep of the house the next day, she was unharmed, but her appearance was radically changed.

"Someone shaved a strip of her fur," Bullington said. "It looks like they took some electric barber

clippers to her and took the fur off right down to her skin."

Bullington said he's relieved that Minuette is all right — it's not like her to stay away from home for more than a few hours at a time. But he's a bit uneasy that someone would use his pet as the brunt of a practical joke.

"I'm not distressed, she doesn't seem traumatized. It's kind of amusing, but it's a little scary too," he said.

Bullington lives in the Lexington Commons North subdivision,

north of Eight Mile and west of Taft. He told his story to *The Northville Record* in the hope that other pet owners in his vicinity will be cautious with their animals.

"Our name and phone number are on her tags, so if she'd wandered into someone's yard and they didn't want her there all they had to do was call us," he insisted. "Whoever did this could do it again."

Bullington spoke to the police but was told no other incidents of the kind had been reported.

Revenue change called 'dramatic'

Wait till next year. That's when the big shift in state shared revenue from older, big cities to out-state townships will start.

Gov. John Engler has signed a new Revenue Sharing Act that changes the formula beginning in fiscal 1998, which starts Oct. 1,

1997. The distribution formula will allocate growth revenues on a per-capita basis instead of the "relative tax effort" basis, which rewarded cities with high tax rates.

"This is the most historic reform in revenue sharing since the program began more than two

decades ago," said.

"It's a dramatic step forward for fairness, equity and common sense."

The new formula won't affect "old" revenues — just "growth" revenues. Growth money will be deposited in a reserve fund.

Low-tax zones approved

State representatives voted for final passage of Senate Bill 668, which allows the state to permit cities to create low-tax "Renaissance Zones." The bill was approved 63-34 at the end of a brief July session.

The bill split both parties deeply and drew negative comments in the House Journal from all shades of opinion. Samples:

Rep. David Jaye, R-Macomb County, a vocal conservative: "This legislation exempts billionaires and millionaires from all state and local taxes. Worse yet, the working men and women of the rest of the state are forced to make up the revenue lost by the city, college, K-12 schools in which the Renaissance Zone is located. People in these zones will even be allowed to vote on future tax increases which they will never have to pay."

Rep. Howard Wetters, D-Kawawlin: "SB 668 is an unwarranted intrusion into the private business sector. We have no idea what this costs. This bill will also allow rich people to establish their 'make believe' residence in a Renaissance Zone and escape all state income taxes."

Family members search for strength

best friend, hit a tree in a Salem Township farmfield July 24.

The accident left the family and the community in shock, and prompted Robert, a computer specialist for Ford Motor Co., to seek solace in the quiet of his backyard.

"That's why I built the fountain," Robert said, still gazing at the trickle of water running over the rocks, his eyes slightly swollen from the tears. "The past few weeks he'd say, 'Dad, when are you going to pull out that stump? He was always getting after me about that and I never had the time to do it. Now I've got nothing but time."

"I figured I'd take out my frustration on that stump, and when I got rid of the stump there was nothing left but a big empty hole. That's when I decided to build the fountain," he continued, his voice still low. "I guess you could say I was inspired."

The family has not left their house on Sunnydale Lane very much since the accident. They had planned a family vacation in Aspen, Colo., but Robert canceled the trip.

"It wouldn't be that much fun now. Maybe we'll go sometime, but right now I don't think any of us really feels like taking a trip," he said. "We're just not ready."

Inside, Pat Mudge gazes at photographs. Dozens of pictures are scattered on the dining room table - photos of Chris with his date during homecoming, photos of Chris with his brother Kevin in a makeshift fort, and photos of Chris with his many friends.

A cutout photograph of Chris in his hockey uniform, wearing his favorite ballcap, stands mounted on a wood block on the windowsill. It is the wide engaging smile, showing off a full set of braces, that catches the eye immediately.

"Chris had the greatest smile, and the most wonderful baby blue eyes you've ever seen," said Pat, admiring the photograph. "He always had a great story to tell, and he was always surrounded by plenty of friends."

"His friends ..." she added in a faraway voice, recalling past times. "That kid had plenty of friends. The phone was constantly ringing from the time he got home from work or school until the time he left to be with his friends."

The teenager enjoyed playing hockey, a sport he took up seven years ago. In his bedroom are several trophies, a Bob Probert Detroit Red Wings jersey, hockey sticks, and various memorabilia.

On the wall hangs an oil painting depicting a lone hockey player skating on a frozen pond lined by pine trees.

"His grandfather painted that for him a few years ago," Robert said. "He knew how much Chris loved hockey, and Chris was real proud of that painting."

Chris worked at a local car wash this summer to save money for his first car. He was also attending summer school, and preparing to enter his junior year at Northville High School, where friends referred to him as "Mudge."

Next to hockey the 16-year-old, who celebrated his birthday on Christmas Day, loved the water - especially water skiing.

"This summer I let him talk me into buying a boat so he could water ski. That's the only reason I bought that boat," Robert said with a nod of his head. "He was also taking scuba diving lessons because he wanted to become a certified diver."

In everything he did, Robert remembered, he included his family and friends.

"He was so likable. He always had a smile and he'd walk right up to you and shake your hand," he said. "He had a way of making you feel important and everyone seemed to gravitate towards Chris. He just loved people."

That fact was evident by the tremendous outpouring of emotion at the teen's funeral last week. More than 100 youths attended the funeral, sharing poems, favorite moments, and tears for the teen. Overall, about 250 people paid their respects to the youth.

"Those kids have been terrific. Many of them showed up the first few days after the accident, and several still stop by to talk, remember Chris, see how we're doing, and some just stop by for a hug," Pat said. "Chris was so well liked. He'd go out of his way for anyone."

A photo collage, constructed by Chris' closest friends, sits alongside the dining room table. Next to it, amidst the various photos, is a 40-foot-long banner inscribed with messages, handprints, and poems - all in memory of Chris.

"The support we have received from Chris' friends, the community, the school district, has been wonderful," Pat explained. "There are just so many people who have been there for us, so many people we need to thank."

I just never realized how much this community cares."

Their surviving son, 11-year-old Kevin, who will enter the sixth grade at Winchester Elementary this fall, has been as solid as a rock, Pat said.

"When he sees me start to break down, he comes over and just hugs me," she said. "He's been real strong for us, and has been a tremendous help."

The family hopes to overcome the grief and put their lives back together.

"It will be hard and will take us some time," Robert said, his voice wavering. "I'm going to miss how much joy he brought me, all of the fun we've had. I was really looking forward to his coming years - graduation, his wedding, being a grandfather - and all of that was wiped out in an instant. We'll never get that back."

Fellow classmate Kellie Reichard echoed the sentiments of many of

Chris' friends.

"He was a great person and a lot of fun to be around. Everyone just loved Chris," Reichard said. "The one thing you noticed immediately was his eyes. He had the bluest and most beautiful eyes you've ever seen."

"Besides the hugs he'd give me, I'll probably miss our talks the most," she continued. "We were wonderful friends, and I'll miss hanging out with him."

Charges recommended against driver of car

The 16-year-old Northville teen responsible for the accident that claimed 16-year-old Chris Mudge could face possible high misdemeanor charges, according to officials from the state police.

Police investigators have recommended the teen be charged with one count of negligent homicide in connection with the July 24 accident in Salem Township. That charge has been passed on to the Washtenaw County prosecutor for consideration. No official charges have been made at this time. Although a preliminary investigation by police found no evidence of alcohol or drug use, results of the toxicology tests on the driver have not yet been released.

At the same time Robert and Pat Mudge are saying that no charges should be brought against the teenager.

"I think we've all been through enough," Robert Mudge said this week. "I don't believe that charging him and forcing all of us to relive the accident would benefit anyone."

The Mudies hold no remorse for the Northville High School stu-

dent, and have written a letter to state police investigators asking them to drop the charges.

"None of this is going to bring anything. It's not going to change Chris back," Mudge said. "(He) did not intend to get into the accident. It was just a case of teenagers not thinking."

Mudge was the front seat passenger in the Chevy Blazer that struck a tree about a half-mile south of Five Mile Road, between Curtis and Currie, at the back of a hay field.

Mudge was pronounced dead at the scene by emergency workers, and the other five teens in the vehicle were transported to area hospitals where they were treated and released.

"(The driver) is going through enough knowing that he caused an accident that resulted in the death of a close friend," Pat Mudge said. "We are not about to hold that against him. He was just like one of our own kids. What we need to do right now is pray for him and help him get through this ordeal as well."

Officials at Northville High School, and in the district office, were saddened by the loss. High

school Principal Tom Johnson said Chris Mudge was a popular student who will be missed by classmates and teachers.

"You hate to see something like this happen to a young person who has so much life ahead," Johnson said. "Our thoughts and prayers definitely go out to the families involved."

The school district called the crisis team into action immediately after news of the accident reached school officials. High school counselors were on hand at the high

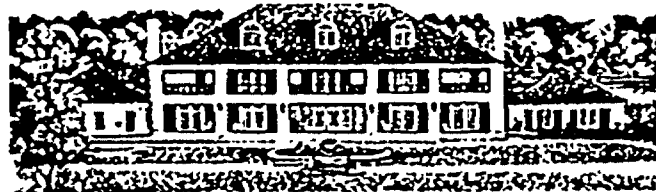
school to help summer school students cope with the tragedy. Mudge had been attending summer school classes.

A scholarship bearing Chris Mudge's name has been created. People wishing to donate to the fund can contact the district's central office for more information. The high school also has plans to honor Mudge with a tree planting ceremony. No date has yet been set, according to school officials.

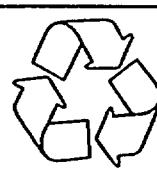

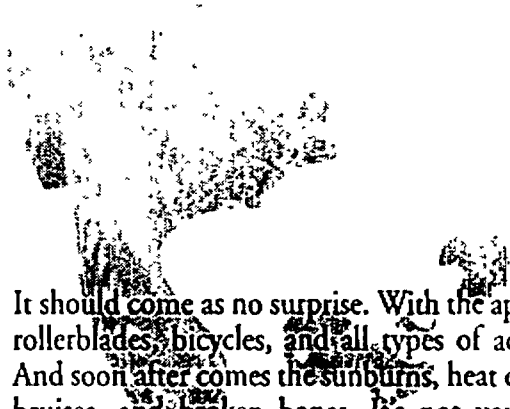

Deer license period delayed

The Department of Natural Resources has traditionally opened the application period for antlerless deer licenses on Aug. 1. However, this year the start will be delayed until Aug. 10 so the DNR has time to complete necessary computer software changes for this program. These changes will simplify the application process for some applicants and provide more information for the customer on the receipt. These changes should not affect the sale of other licenses or applications.

These changes are part of an

ongoing effort to make improvements to the system that will benefit hunters and anglers.

This delay should have minimal impact on applicants. Most applications are received by the DNR during the last two weeks of the application period. Of the 382,700 applications received last year, only 4,200 were made during the first 10 days of the program.

Even with a delay in the start of the application period, hunters will have more than six weeks to submit their applications. The deadline for applications is Sept. 24.

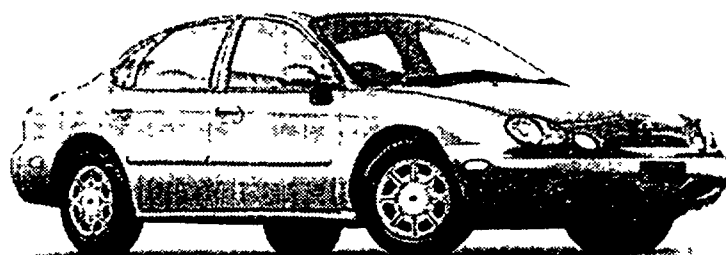

During the month of September the Northville Historical Society and Mill Race Village participate in two of their major events of the year. On the second weekend in September, Sept. 14 and 15, Mill Race buildings will be open on Saturday and Sunday from 1 until 4 p.m. as part of Northville's annual Victorian Festival. Special events are planned for both days at the village.

Sunday features the duck race, an old fashioned Victorian afternoon, and a variety of crafters. Special programs will also be included on Saturday's agenda this year with the possibility that the popular community hat judging contest will move to that afternoon.

Two weeks later on Friday, Sept. 28, and Saturday, Sept. 29, the Historical Society once again stages Tivoli Fair. The Fair, a juried arts and crafts fair, provides revenue for the continued maintenance and operation of Mill Race Village. The Fair, now in its 27th year, raises more than half of the village's operating revenue. Co-chairs for this year's event are Betty Omar and Diane Rockall.

The chairs are assisted by a substantial number of committees and volunteers from the community. Committee chairs this year include: Melody Arndt - bake sale; Judy Kohl - hostesses; Rita Turnbull - exhibitor refreshments; Carolyn Stuart - cleanup; Jan Juhasz - marking; Cathy Payne - check-in; Sally Henrikson - assignments; Joelle Sarkozy - signs and fillers; Frank Cunningham and Art Rockall - opening and closing; and John Reeber - setup.

All of these individuals will need help with their committee work. In addition, chairs are still needed to coordinate cleanup during the show, parking, and placement of signs at city entrances.

If you wish to volunteer to serve on any committee please call the Mill Race office at 348-1845. Mill Race Village belongs to the community and needs the community to help it survive.

Mill Race Village was established on property donated to the city of Northville by Ford Motor Co. in 1972. By the time the transaction was completed three buildings had already been placed on the site: Wash Oak School, New School Church, and Hunter House.

The city asked the Northville Historical Society to serve as caretaker for the village which was formally dedicated July 4, 1976. Every year since then the village has hosted the community's traditional Fourth of July picnic celebration.

During its 20-plus years of operation the village has added Yerkes House, Cottage House, a gazebo, Hirsch Blacksmith Shop, Cady Inn, and an interurban station. All of the buildings accept Wash Oak School and the interurban station came from locations within the city. Wash Oak was located on Currie Road near the Washtenaw-Oakland County border. The interurban station stood originally at Eight Mile and Newburgh and served as a waiting room on the Northville-Pontiac line.

Hirsch Blacksmith Shop and the gazebo were both constructed on site from plans of formerly existent structures. The original blacksmith shop was located on Hutton just north of Main. It later became a gasoline service station and was torn down during the 1930s. More about Mill Race next week.

Novi's population increases

Longtime residents who gripe about Novi's fast growth aren't just chronic complainers. Now they've got the demographics as their proof.

From 1990 to 1996, the city's population has soared by 23 percent.

According to the results of a mid-decade census compiled this spring, Novi can now boast of 40,534 citizens, 7,536 more than

six years ago. In the 1980 census, as completed by the U.S. government, Novi had 32,998 residents.

"A lot of people thought it was going to be higher. I predicted 40,000," City Manager Ed Kriewall said. "There hasn't been any multiple housing built to speak of."

On average, 1,507 moved into Novi or were born to existing families each year from 1991 to April 1996.

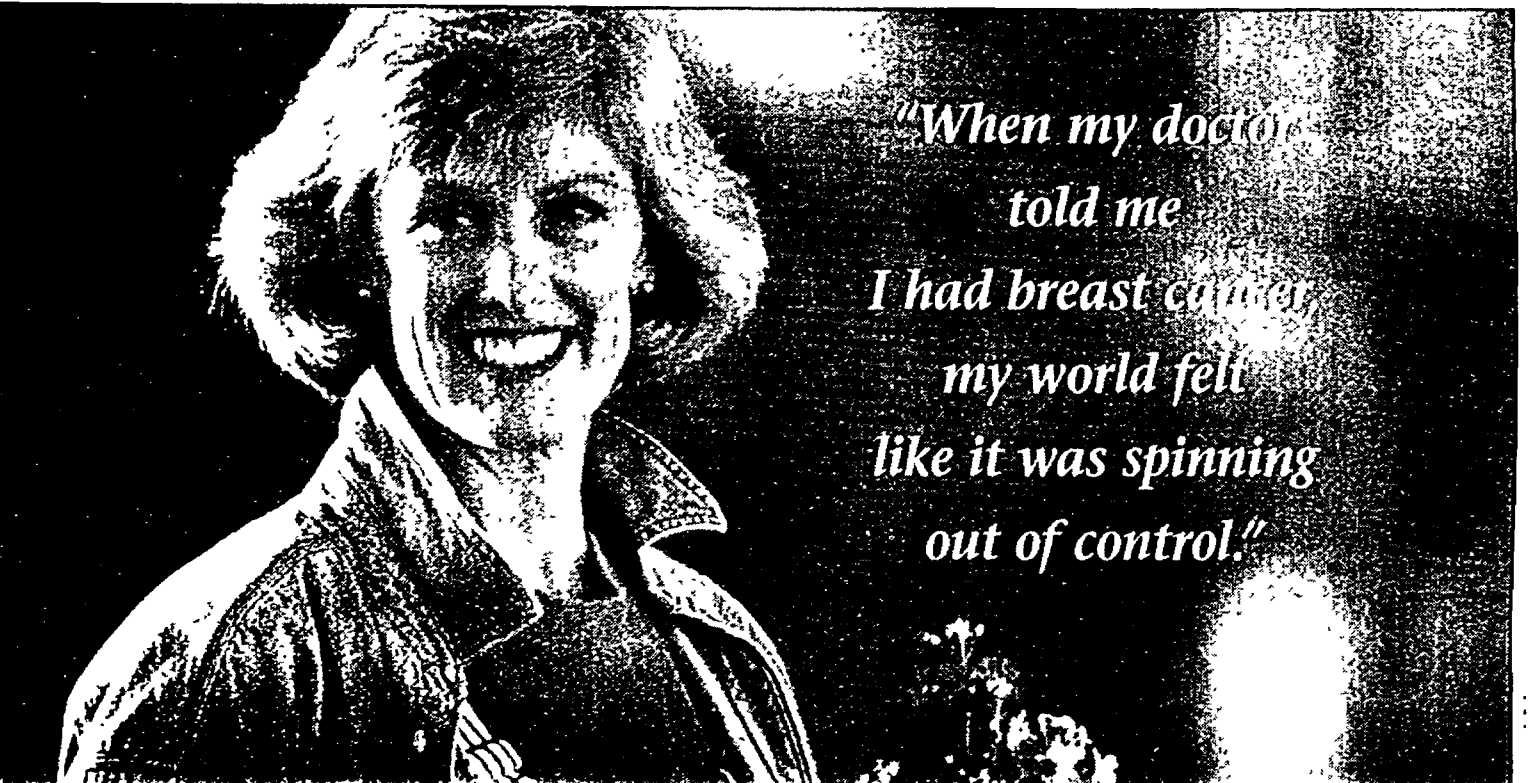
County Parks director Hurley Coleman.

Law, McCotter win bids; Cassis on top in field of 3

Two of the more heated primary campaigns actually fizzled on election day with incumbents for the 20th District state House of Representatives and 10th District Wayne County Commission easily defeating their respective challengers.

Voters in the 20th District selected incumbent Gerald Law, R-Plymouth, over challenger Jerry Vorva by a 2 to 1 margin. Law received 4,511 (62 percent) votes to Vorva's 2,808 (38 percent).

There was little doubt how the two GOP candidates felt about each other during the campaign — Law claimed Vorva was unresponsive in

office, and Vorva labeled Law as just another politician out to get reelected as often as possible.

The two had faced off for the same seat two years ago, when Law defeated Vorva. Vorva was the 20th District representative in 1993-94.

Law will now face Democratic challenger Deborah Hoadley in the general election Nov. 5. Hoadley ran unopposed in the primary.

In the race for the 10th District Wayne County Commission seat, incumbent Thaddeus McCotter easily outdistanced Republican challenger Jeff Schroder, winning by a little less than a 2-to-1 margin. McCotter received 4,094 votes (63 percent) to Schroder's 2,396 (37

percent).

The Wayne County race was characterized by aggressive campaigning by Schroder, who once served as a staff member for state Rep. Deborah Whyman, R-Canton. During the race Schroder charged two-term incumbent McCotter with supporting affirmative action and no-bid contracts on the county commission.

McCotter dismissed Schroder's campaign, saying the college student entertained no real hope of winning and was really only trying to set up a 1998 bid for the state senate by Whyman.

McCotter will go on to face Democrat Karl Burnett, who ran unopposed in the primary election. Burnett ran

unsuccessfully against McCotter in 1994.

Both the 20th state house district and the 10th Wayne County district include Northville Township and Wayne County Northville.

State legislators are paid approximately \$46,000 a year. Wayne County Commissioners make the same amount, as their salaries are tied to those of their Lansing counterparts.

Novi City Council member Nancy Cassis took the Republican nomination for state representative in the 38th District, which includes Oakland County Northville.

Cassis lost her bid for Novi mayor in 1993, then swept back into the Novi City Council in 1995.

Cassis won both Republican primaries for the state House of Representatives race Tuesday.

"We are vibrant and alive this morning. The sun is shining today. The adrenaline is pumping," Cassis said on Wednesday.

Districtwide, in the general primary, Cassis took 3,050 votes, followed by Northville resident Chris Bachelder with 2,764 votes and Novi resident Craig DeRoche with 1,660 votes.

Now it's back to the campaign trail for Cassis and

Democrat Gary Johnson of Milford, who ran unopposed in his party's primary. The two will meet at the polls in November as they vie for a two-year term beginning in January 1997.

In addition to the Oakland County portion of Northville, the 38th District includes Novi, Novi Township, Milford, South Lyon, Lyon Township, Wixom and Walled Lake. Voter turnout was somewhat less than 14 percent.

Because of the resignation of state representatives Willis Bullard, now a state senator,

a special primary was also held Tuesday to fill his house seat from November to Jan. 1. Johnson and Cassis will also vie for this short term.

Cassis won that primary as well, but the voting pattern appears to indicate some confusion. In the general primary, 8,786 cast ballots but in the special primary only 8,524 voted.

In the special primary districtwide, Cassis took 2,957 votes, Bachelder, 2,671 votes and DeRoche, 1,650 votes. Johnson, again unopposed, garnered 1,246 votes.

Cannon bombed in attempt to take Salem Township supervisor post

Northville Police Chief Rod Cannon will be sticking around for at least a little while longer.

The long-time police official lost his bid to capture the Republican nomination for supervisor of Salem Township in Tuesday's primary election. Cannon ended up in third place with 157 votes, behind winner Michael Penn, 297 votes, and Marie Sherry, 212 votes.

The results are unofficial.

In a candidate profile in the *South Lyon Herald* Cannon said that if he won the seat, he would retire from his post as Northville's top police officer immediately.

"I've put 40 years in and that's good enough," he was quoted as saying.

Northville officials have said privately that the chief will most likely retire sometime in November.

Cannon has been Northville Police Chief for 17 years. He was selected for the post on April 16,

1979. Before that he served as a police officer for the city of Plymouth.

Cannon ran a low-key campaign and chose not to spend too much money on his bid for the supervi-

sor's seat. He was unavailable for comment at press time.

Northville officials have known

of Cannon's election bid for several months, according to city councilman Chuck Keys.

Sweltering buildings draw plenty of heat from election workers

You can't provide something you don't have.

That's what Northville School Superintendent Leonard Reznierski is reminding Northville Township officials who voiced complaints about conditions at polling places at Winchester, Silver Springs and Moraine elementary schools.

Election officials spent more than 13 hours in sweltering heat inside those buildings during Tuesday's election. According to Township Clerk Sue Hillebrand, the conditions at Winchester and Moraine were unbearable as temperatures and humidity soared, turning the polling places into virtual sweatboxes.

With temperatures outside running at more than 90 degrees, it didn't take long for the schools to heat up, she said.

The problem, according to Hillebrand, was lack of air conditioning, and the clerk said that when she had requested to use the schools as polling sites, she also asked that the air conditioning be left on to keep election workers cool.

"This wasn't the fault of the custodians, this is a management problem. We had arranged to keep the air conditioning on while the polls were open," she explained. "I cannot believe the district would

do this. I think the board of education and district officials failed the taxpayers in this instance."

Most election workers were senior citizens, Hillebrand added. Some suffered from asthma and the rising heat and humidity made a few people sick. The humidity also caused ballots to jam the voting machine, she added.

Reznierski said the incident was unfortunate, but there was nothing any school official could have done about it.

"We don't have air conditioning in the gymnasiums at Silver Springs and Winchester, and Moraine has no air conditioning at all," Reznierski explained. "They were asking for things that we didn't have. If the gyms would have been equipped with air conditioning, we would have had the units running for them."

He added that the district will be installing air conditioning in those schools if voters approve the upcoming \$61-million bond request.

Reznierski said he would contact Hillebrand and address any problems that might arise in the November general election.

"We're not trying to be obstructionist, it's just that you can't provide air conditioning if you don't have it," he concluded. "We want to remain positive partners with township and city officials and continue to work together."

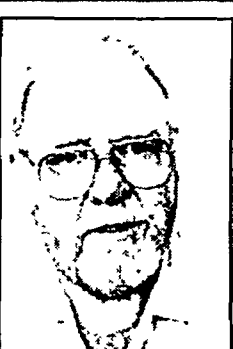

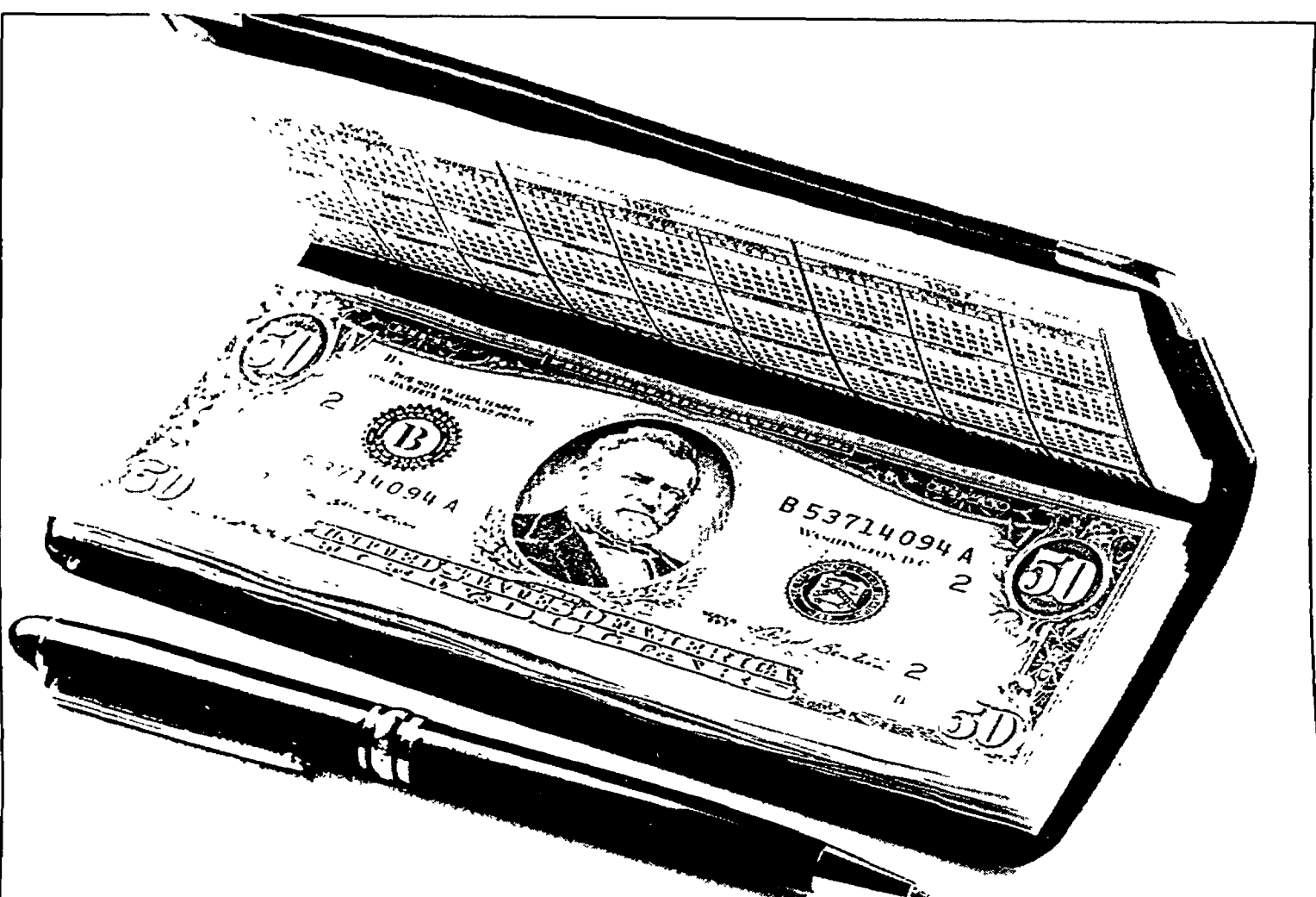
First, he is thinking about making an independent bid for supervisor in opposition to Woodside in the Nov. 5 election.

all of the proceeds not be usable for the employment of technology support personnel, it could still be used for other educational technology hardware or software." Street explained to board members. "I should also note that using the enhancement millage proceeds over a five year period cannot be specified on the ballot, even though that is the plan and that the dollar amount to be raised must be stated."

Rezmierski said that more than 60 districts are slated to hold bond elections in September. That number resulted in the district choosing its election date early to ensure that the enhancement millage vote would take place before the Oct. 1 deadline, he explained.

By state law the district can't hold a bond election within 30 days of a state or federal election

The state's primary election took place this week and a general election is scheduled for November.

The bond language calls for the district to borrow a sum not to exceed \$61.52 million and issue general obligation unlimited revenue bonds for the purpose of:

- Erecting, furnishing and equipping a new high school building;
- Erecting, furnishing and equipping additions to and partially remodeling, refurbishing and reequipping school buildings;
- Acquiring and installing educational technology system improvements and purchasing school buses;
- Developing and improving playgrounds, outdoor physical education and athletic facilities and sites.

Under state law, bond proceeds cannot be used for maintenance costs, teacher, administrator or

employee salaries, fringe benefits or other operating systems.

The district's construction consulting firm of Fanning & Howie developed the bond proposal and application.

According to a district-proposed bond cost summary, \$48 million will be spent on the construction of the new high school facility. The conversion of the current high school and other school upgrades have been estimated at \$11 million, with an additional \$5.2 million in technology upgrade costs.

The total package will cost taxpayers \$61 million, an estimated increase of 2.35 mills.

The life of the bond will run somewhere between 20 and 30 years, depending on market conditions, Rezmierski added.

District gets new hires to handle student growth

There will be a few unfamiliar faces in some Northville school classrooms when the new school year begins.

With a growing school population and employee turnover, the school district has hired 24 new teachers to start the year.

That leaves nine vacancies the district must fill before classes begin Aug. 26, according to Personnel Director Roy Danley, who introduced the new hires to Northville school board members Monday.

"We have experienced a very high level of activity during the months of June and July," Danley said.

"Continued growth in student enrollments combined with retirements have resulted in increased hiring."

The district expects the student population to increase and should have a better feel for student population numbers within the next few weeks.

District officials received and processed more than 1,300 applications, Danley said. Of that number officials interviewed 109 people.

"I was extremely impressed with these individuals and I believe they represent the very best out there," he said.

The remaining vacancies will be filled by the first day of school, Danley added.

District Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski said the new teachers will continue the district's legacy of excellence in education.

"You will find that this district has a proud history of excellence, and we will continue to strive to provide the best education for our students," he said.

State agency ruling could result in savings on combined gas bill

A recent rule change by the Public Service Commission could save Northville School District taxpayers \$42,000.

The district finds itself eligible, under a PSC ruling, to combine its purchases of natural gas, thus qualifying the district for a reduced rate.

"For the past two years (we) have been monitoring the possibility of a rule change by the Public Service

Commission to allow natural gas consumers who own multiple facilities to group their purchase of natural gas," Assistant Superintendent Dave Bollitho said in a report to the school board. "Under the old guidelines district owned facilities were evaluated on a building by building basis."

According to the district's natural gas consultant, Bud Kunz, grouping the buildings under one contract could save the district an estimated \$42,934 annually.

The district is currently bound by a five year contract with Stand Energy Corp., and school board members voted to amend that contract to take advantage of the possible savings.

According to district estimates, Northville High School would realize the most savings - roughly \$23,000. Cooke and Meads Mill middle schools would save about \$3,000, and the five elementary schools would save approximately \$2,000 to \$2,500 per building.

The new, two-story home of the district library will be more than 25,000 square feet in size and house over 75,000 circulation items. By comparison the current library is 6,500 square feet and houses 40,000 items.

Besides room for more books, videos, newspapers, magazines and other items the new building will provide the public with activity rooms, meeting and quiet study rooms and much more seating.

Grand opening ceremonies for the new library will begin at 2 p.m. on Oct. 6. Among the events planned are performances by the Schoolcraft College Wind Ensemble and magician Ming the Magnificent.

Library reading program keeps reading skills sharp

Hundreds of kids will trek back to school soon with reading skills a little sharper than their classmates thanks to the Northville District Library's just-completed summer reading program.

The six-week summer library tradition wrapped up late last month and was a big success, according to youth librarians Dorie Freebury and Joanne Dewey.

The two coordinated the summer reading program, which aims at getting kids to become lifelong readers by making reading a regular habit and by showing them what the Northville library has to offer.

If you don't exercise your muscles they will atrophy, and if you don't develop and use your reading skills they too will decline, something that happens all too often to

kids out of school for a whole summer.

That's where the summer reading program comes in. Serving 289 children this time around the program began in June shortly after school let out and concluded a couple of weeks ago.

The students are divided into two types: those who can read now and those who are too young just yet. The former are encouraged to read regularly. The latter, the library's "read to me" kids, get turned on to books by listening to others read to them.

Young readers who completed 10 books during the program received a treat courtesy of the Chesapeake Bagel Factory while the "read to me" crowd got the same from the Great Harvest Bread Company after listening to 24 books read to them by parents

or friends.

Accompanying all that was a slew of fun and different activities held at and around the library.

Livonia musician Gerri Green and Ben Spitzer, a magician from Holly, kicked the program off. Kids could also try their hands at more than a dozen different arts and crafts projects. The results of their labors remain proudly displayed on library staffers' office walls.

"Science Alive" allowed kids to get a close-up look at animals like a gigantic python, while "Brown Sugar and Spice" gave the "read to me" bunch a chance to hear African-American tales courtesy of Jacqueline Galloway-Blake.

Then there was Marcey Walsh and Carnivale!, a presentation featuring musical instruments from around the world the kids could actually touch and try.

mandy, France, in the year 1088.

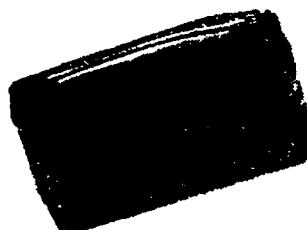
Originally they were used in churches to bring light into buildings, according to librarian and clerestory specialist Jeannine Davidson. Over the centuries non-religious buildings

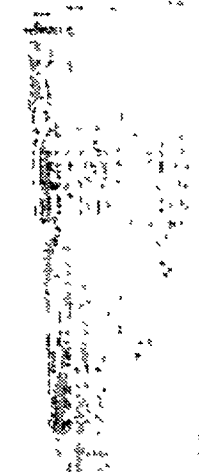

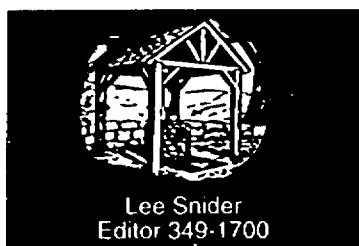

Low voter turnout mars election outcome

The speeches are finished, the corks popped, the hugs exchanged, the tears shed. Another election is over.

For the defeated, it's time to roll up the banners, take down the campaign signs and make plans for the future.

The winners - at least those competing in contested races - will have little opportunity to catch their breath as they prepare for the campaign leading up to the general election in November.

Congratulations go out to the winners, especially the victorious candidates in the Northville Township election: Karen Woodside, supervisor; Sue Hillebrand, clerk; Dick Henningsen, treasurer; and Mark Abbo, Bill Selinsky, Marv Gans and Russ Fogg, trustee.

What happens next is not as certain as would at first appear. Defeated supervisor hopeful Bob Grant is promising a further challenge of Woodside, and each of the Republican nominees for trustee faces possible elimination with Democrat Shirley Klokenga entering the mix this fall.

Only Hillebrand and Henningsen, it seems, are assured of smooth sailing between now and Nov. 5.

In any event, the primary hurdle has been vaulted and a collective sigh of relief has gone up over the community.



Government

As with every election, there are disappointments. Not all the candidates we endorsed on this page emerged on top in their races, and it's always a bitter pill to be overruled by the voters.

But, to us, the real disappointment can be found in the participation levels: just 23 percent in the township and 21 percent in the city.

The inescapable conclusion is that apathy remains the majority sentiment, and that's a shame. It means the winners are unable to lay claim to a genuine mandate from the people, and the losers are able to say they weren't rejected by a widely dissatisfied electorate.

We in the press continually preach the importance of voter involvement and, though the message doesn't seem to be getting across, we'll keep speaking our peace on the subject.

The message bears endless repeating.

Mega center has face of true movie monster

Everyone loves a good movie. Even in this day and age when VCRs, computer networks and cable interactive access have expanded our entertainment choices a jillion-fold, people continue to queue up at the box office for an evening of thrills in front of the big screen.

But, though moviegoing remains a highly popular pastime, there are limits to its appeal and its usefulness.

And there's good reason to wonder whether the theater development envisioned for the Seven Mile/Haggerty vicinity isn't just a little on the excessive side.

As everyone knows, developers have put forward a proposal to construct an enormous complex consisting of 20 movie screens with a total of 4,056 seats. In addition to the auditoriums, the huge campus would also include two restaurants on 35 acres of land.

A third restaurant, a retail location and even a hotel could be added at some point in the future.

The site is on the east side of Haggerty so the venue, technically, is Livonia. But that doesn't mean the project wouldn't have a significant impact on Northville Township neighborhoods, which lie only yards away on the other side of the road.

Residents of the WindRidge subdivision, in particular, are concerned about potential traffic problems and quality of life issues, and they've taken

their misgivings to Livonia city officials. The Livonia Planning Commission apparently heeded their words and recommended rejection of the necessary zoning waivers.

But the city council, which has the final say, seems less moved by the pleas of residents and could be on the verge of voting in favor of the complex.

Mayor Jack Kirksey has threatened to veto any council approval (Livonia has a strong mayor system), but warns against anybody getting their hopes up: an override, he believes, would open the way for the development.

We have a hard time finding justification for anything as intrusive as a 20-screen mega movie house and believe Livonia officials are going to open a can of worms if they're poised to grant approval.

Even if 20 screens aren't more than the local market can bear, the draw of such a place would surely visit congestion, environmental problems and sign pollution on the area.

The Livonia City Council is scheduled to discuss the proposed development at its meeting next Monday. A vote is also possible.

Our hope is that the elected officials who represent our neighbors to the east would look with a critical eye at this proposal and see if for what it is - a commercial monstrosity that would be a long-term liability to the community.

Put blame where blame is due

I knew I'd have to write this column.

When we reported the salaries of the Northville School District superintendent and central office administrators last week, I told my boss, Lee Snider, that I'd be getting frantic phone calls and complaints about the wages received by those officials.

Our readers, once again, proved me right.

The first complaint came at lunch when a Northville mother with her two young children approached me at my table at Joseph's Coney Island.

"You're the one who covers the schools, right?" she asked.

I nodded my head and gave her a polite smile, knowing what was coming. She didn't disappoint. She unraveled her newspaper, pointed to the front page story, and jumped right in.

"When are you going to start holding these administrators accountable?" she started off. "How can they accept that much money for just sitting behind a desk all day?"

She went on that way for another minute or so, and when she was done I again smiled politely and asked her a simple question.

"What does your husband do for a living?"

She gave me a confused look, then told me her husband worked for Ford Motor Co. as a design engineer. As I continued my questioning I found that he made a fairly substantial salary (she wouldn't provide me with

the figure, but she said her family lived quite comfortably), drove a company car, had a good pension plan, and had good medical and dental insurance that covered the entire family.

Beginning to see some similarities yet?

Finally I asked her one last question: "If Ford officials told your husband he was going to receive a huge salary boost, would you encourage him to turn it down?"

Her answer was exactly what I expected. "Certainly not, that would be stupid."

She's right, it would be stupid, and I guess the point I'm trying to make here is that not too many people would turn down a six figure salary. Just like they wouldn't turn down a pay increase, a company car, a pension plan, or insurance. People need to remember that Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski and the other administrators didn't give themselves their salaries - people would have a justifiable complaint if they did. The school board set the salary levels.

So if the patrons of the district believe school officials are being compensated a bit high for the duties they perform, they need to take that up with the school board, which meets publicly twice a month.

True, I am concerned that almost 70 percent of the district's \$30-million budget is spent on salaries. Especially when there's things like new computers and other technology needed in our schools. At the same time, I'm not about to beat up the superintendent or administration for accepting salaries given to them by our elected officials.

That, as the woman said, would be just plain stupid.

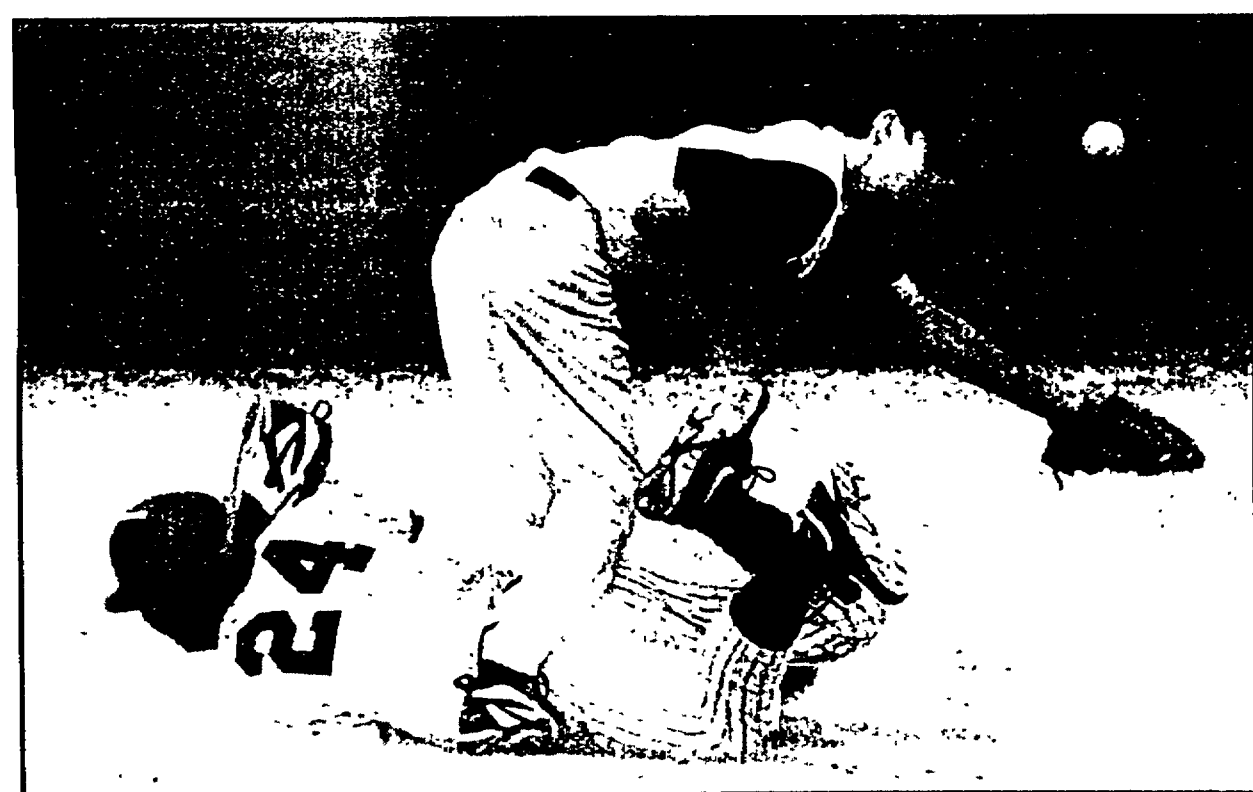

Be considerate of neighbors

To the Editor:

We live on North Rogers Street in the downtown area. Many of you are familiar with Rogers ... in fact, if you've ever had to travel from Seven to Eight Mile, anyone will tell you that Rogers is the best way to bypass downtown. Just cross Main, up the hill, around Potomac and down to Lexington. To many of you, it's a real time-saver.

This kind of attitude has turned North Rogers into a very dangerous street.

Last month, our dog was struck by a car traveling down Rogers. We're adamant about keeping him on a leash, or in the backyard. Unfortunately, accidents happen and he was hit by someone ... someone in a hurry who didn't see him until it was too late. Someone driving too fast, according to witnesses. Someone who didn't even have the time to stop and find out if the dog was dead or alive. We want to use this story to illustrate a very important point.

Years ago, you couldn't use Rogers as a shortcut from Seven to Eight Mile. But somewhere along the way, it was decided that the street should be opened, perhaps so school buses could reach the new subdivisions. At the time, Beck Road had yet to be paved so it wasn't a viable alternative. Instead, North Rogers opened up and the traffic began to come.

We bought our house in 1989. Over the past few years, we've noticed a huge increase in the amount of traffic using Rogers as a bypass to Eight Mile. Of course, the increase in traffic is unavoidable. But it's not the amount of traffic that's so alarming ... it's the attitude of many drivers who use Rogers as their regular route.

Awhile back, my husband and I began to look for ways to fight back. After discussions with neighbors and the local police, we learned that speed bumps, stop signs, etc., had failed to slow the worst offenders. So, we began parking our cars in the street on Saturday and Sunday during the summer, in hopes that opposing traffic will slow down. We're also taking down license numbers whenever possible and passing them on to the police.

Within the past few years, at least six (if not more) new families have moved to North Rogers, mostly young married couples like my husband and I.

Think about the children who will live there someday. And think about the tragedy that could be avoided if you would just slow down.

Just think.

Hunting story needs clarifying

To the Editor:

Arguments in Tim Richard's bear hunting article deserve refutation.

CUB's ballot proposal bans bear baiting and hounding, period. Any "first step" in banning hunting would've destroyed CUB's coalition (since its founder is a deer hunter).

Eliminating baiting and hounding doesn't necessarily mean that fewer bears will be killed: The DNR sets the number of bear permits issued each year; it could raise that amount.

At a meeting of the House Conservation, Environment and Great Lakes Committee, members asked DNR representatives if this had been considered. It

had not.

To use "scientific management" you should test your hypothesis. In asserting that bear numbers would rise without baiting and hounding, the DNR isn't using science, it's using conjecture.

Eliminating bear hounding is consistent in not using dogs with big game. Deer hunters cannot use dogs, so fawns have the summer, free of dogs, to prepare for the harsh winter.

Conversely, bear hounders train their dogs in summer, and, while an adult sow can out sprint a dog, a cub cannot. Moreover, banning bait would eliminate many so-called "predatory bears."

My family has had property on Drummond Island for 50 years and had nuisance bears only when guests became careless with garbage. The last mauling on the island was a hounder who prodded a sow and cubs in their den.

Finally, despite its intent, the counter proposal to CUB doesn't clearly negate CUB, if both are passed. If passed, the former would require the DNR to work within current law; so, any DNR attempt to override CUB's petitions would appear to violate Michigan's Constitution.

While the DNR does a good job, day-to-day, of handling wildlife issues, voters would be foolish to vote to limit their democratic opportunities (especially if they support the counter proposal to negate CUB and the two are actually not in conflict).

Come to meeting on school issue

To the Editor:

On Monday, Sept. 23, the residents of the Northville Public School district will be presented with an opportunity to make a significant investment in our community and its children.

Our board of education has determined to place before the voters on that date two proposals - a \$61,520,000 bond issue and a one-year 1.95 mill enhancement millage. The bond issue will provide necessary improvements to our school facilities, including a new high school, repairs, renovations and remodeling of existing facilities, and educational technology. Including computer hardware and software.

The enhancement millage will provide funds to allow effective use of the district's investment in educational technology.

An independent citizens committee known as "Continuing Excellence for Northville Children - Looking Beyond 2000" has been organized to support these two ballot proposals. This committee will be holding an initial meeting at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, Aug. 8, at The Raven, 145 N. Center St. (corner of Center and Dunlap Streets), in downtown Northville. Anyone interested in helping bring about the passage of the two propositions, or in finding out more information about the issues, is encouraged to join us at that meeting.

The ballot propositions have been approved by the board of education only after years of study by at least four citizens committees. These committees undertook independent research and analysis and made recommendations with respect to a number of issues including:

- The capacity of our existing school facilities and the projected student population over the next several years.

- The most cost effective approaches to meeting our needs for appropriate educational facilities for the children of our community.

- The need for educational technology and the appropriate uses thereof.

- The need for additional "enhancement" millage to provide training and staff support for the district's educational technology.

The findings and recommendations of the citizens committees have since been confirmed and validated by outside demographers, architects and consultants.

We hope all interested citizens will join us at The Raven this Thursday, Aug. 8, at 7:30 p.m.

Lemon aids New car owners do have rights

When you purchase a new car you drive it away from the showroom assuming that the next time you'll see the dealership will be for a routine oil change.

But what if you bought a lemon, a car that has a major problem?

"In most instances, lemons are not cars that can't be fixed, they are cars that haven't been fixed," said Rick Gamber, executive director of the Michigan Consumers Federation, a non-profit consumer advocacy organization founded in 1990.

The chances of buying a lemon today are amazingly small, according to Gamber.

The seven-page Auto Lemon Law of 1986 protects consumers who have continuing problems with new passenger vehicles for a limited time. The Secretary of State's offices are required, under the Lemon Law, to hand out information about the law to consumers of new cars.

That's not to say you're on your own after that time has elapsed, but it is much more difficult.

"The (manufacturers) are doing a much better job than they were 10 years ago," said Gamber.

Major problems include transmission skipping, burning oil, failure to start, a leaking trunk, stalling problems, safety problems and braking difficulties.

"Major" may mean something different to each consumer.

A common mistake consumers make when they have a problem with their new cars is to let the problem slide.

"Don't let them linger on," Gamber said. "Sometimes people will call here and they will have a problem for two years and finally decide to do something."

Arbitration programs are open to any disgruntled customer, not just new car buyers.

Recourse is on an individual basis with the arbitration board after one year. The longer the consumer waits, the higher the deductions may be for mileage on the car.

"I think people are very patient with dealers, but at some point, people need to contact the manufacturer, call the customer service office and get them involved," said Gamber.

If a dealership can't find the problem, they will make a notation on the work order, such as CNR, indicating the problem was undiagnosed. Dealerships vary

in the terminology of their notations.

"People have to be more insistent on requiring the dealership to identify the problem and get it fixed," said Gary Krochmal, an attorney with Freedman, Krochmal and Goldin P.C. in South Lyon.

If a consumer doesn't get satisfaction soon enough from the dealership, they should follow up with the manufacturer's zone manager.

Faced with the inconvenience of being without a car, consumers also make the mistake of avoiding getting the car fixed.

"You and I don't want to be without our cars," Krochmal said. "It is easier not to deal with the problem and drive it."

Another mistake consumers make is keeping poor records. The Lemon Law states that the consumer will have to prove all correspondence, work orders with dates and mileage of the vehicle at

the time of service if they need to go to arbitration.

"I think one thing people need to do a better job of is record keeping," Gamber said. "A lot of time people don't save those records and it causes a delay to get those from the dealership," Gamber said.

A lot of times the manufacturer will meet the consumer at the dealership, and the result and sometimes wait with them while the car is getting fixed.

"Pick up the phone and do something," Gamber said.

Most manufacturers have an arbitration board that meets federal standards, and they would rather settle there than go to court.

Information about arbitration is included in the owner's manual of the car.

Consumers can call the Attorney General's Consumer Protection Division at (517) 373-1140 for more information.

Lemon law revealed

Public Act 87 of 1986, Michigan's Auto Lemon Law, protects consumers who have continuing problems with new (not leased) passenger vehicles, pick-ups and vans they have purchased.

According to Act 87:

"New" means the vehicle is covered by a manufacturer's warranty when purchased by the current owner.

To qualify for a refund, the vehicle must have been purchased on or after June 25, 1986, must have been repaired for the same major problem at least four times (the first repair must have been performed by the dealer within one year after delivery or before the manufacturer's warranty expires, whichever is earlier), or been in for repairs for a total of 30 days or more during the manufacturer's warranty period or within one year from the date of delivery, whichever is earlier.

The manufacturer is legally responsible for repairing the vehicle while it is under warranty. The consumer should contact the manufacturer's customer service department, by return receipt mail, not the dealership; provide them with a list of the defects and an explanation of what has been done to attempt to fix them. The manufacturer will then contact the consumer as soon as reasonably possible.

Keep copies of all correspondence with the manufacturer and the dealer, all work orders, including the dates the work was performed and the mileage at the time of repair.

It is advisable to contact the manufacturer when a serious problem occurs. Under the Lemon Law, the consumer is required to notify the manufacturer in writing, by return receipt mail, of the defect after at least the third repair for the same major defect or after the car has been out of service for repairs for at least 25 days during the warranty period, or within one year from the date of delivery, whichever is earlier.

The manufacturer should notify the consumer within a reasonable amount of time of a convenient repair facility for the consumer to take the vehicle to. The manufacturer then has five days to repair the defect.

If the situation remains unresolved after taking all the necessary steps, the consumer can request a comparable model as a replacement for the defective car or a refund. The manufacturer may deduct up to 10-cents per mile for the use of the consumer's original car up to the time of the first repair as long as it does not exceed 10 percent of the purchase price, if the consumer decides on a refund.

Most major manufacturers participate in arbitration programs as an informal dispute settlement procedure.

If a consumer decides to withhold payment because of the problem, the Auto Lemon Law does not protect them. Call an attorney before stopping payment.

There is a section in Act 87 that states that the secretary of state shall include with any new motor vehicle title a written statement in slightly larger bold print than the standard print size that if the vehicle the consumer purchased is defective the consumer may be entitled under state law to a replacement or refund. Information on how a refund or replacement may be obtained must also be included.

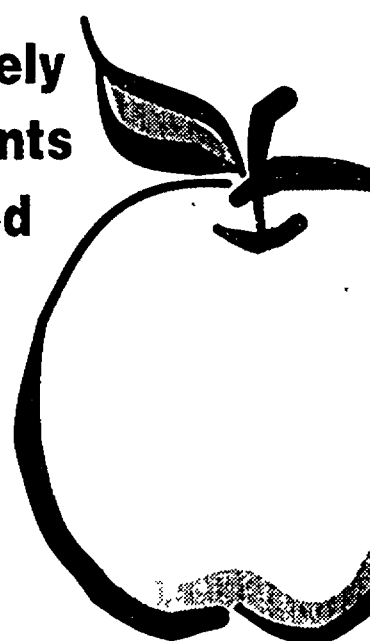

Couples dine in China

A funny thing happened on the way to Beijing.

When Tom and Carol Shaal bumped into Bill Craft at a recent retirement party they learned they would be on the same 13-hour, non-stop flight to Beijing with Craft and his friend, Mary Padgett.

No strangers to each other, Craft was the principal at Amerman Elementary School while the Shaals' two children attended school. The Shaals were very active in the PTA and Carol later became a teacher in the Northville School District. Craft retired after 18 years at Amerman 10 years ago.

In Beijing, Tom picked up Craft and Padgett in his chauffeur driven

Audi and took them to his three bedroom, three bathroom, completely westernized apartment on the 17th floor of a new building. On the second and third floors there were amenities such as a swimming pool and an exercise room. Later the couples went to dinner.

Tom will be in Beijing for two and a half years with GM's Delphi Automotive Systems where he is the director of worldwide purchasing.

While on their six-day vacation to Beijing, Craft and Padgett saw the sites on a four-day guided tour, which included a trip to the Great Wall, the Summer Palace and the Forbidden City. They also traveled by cab and bicycle-driven rickshaw.

Bicycles are the most common form of travel in China. They are also used to make deliveries. Craft and Padgett saw one delivery man carrying living room furniture on the back of his bike.

"It is sort of fun," he said. "You think you're going to get something, but you're not. They bargain everyday, all day."

"I never paid more than half," he said.

The couple also shopped at a people's store, which adhered to price controls.

"You can't dicker there," Craft said of the people's store. "But in a silk (bazaar) you can bargain."

Craft and Padgett saw entrepreneurs on the side of the road offering services from fixing flat tires to giving hair cuts and massages to dentistry.

This was the first trip to China for Craft and Padgett.

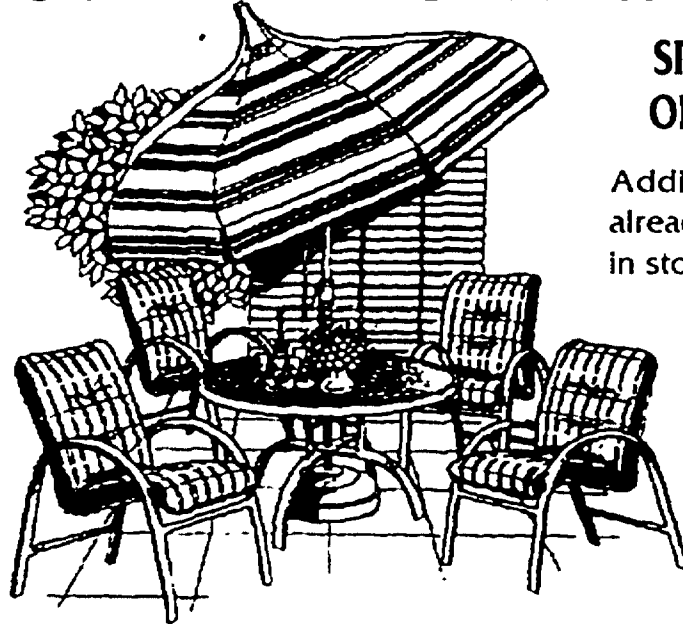

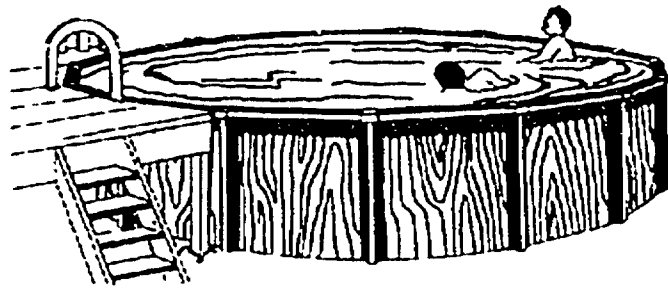

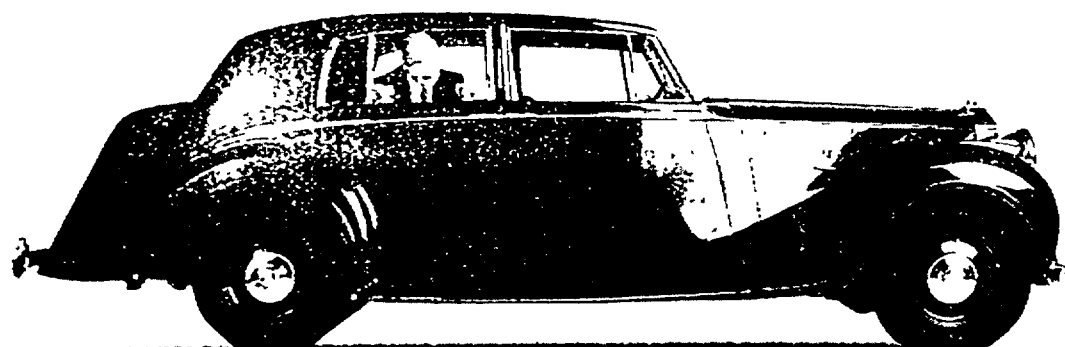

Summer brings lawn mowing accidents

Your yard may not be as green and lush as you'd like, but it can be safe thanks to lawn mowing precautions offered by Botsford's director of emergency medicine, Ronald Lagerveld, D.O.

While some of these ideas may seem obvious, Dr. Lagerveld emphasizes you can never be too careful.

He suggests you begin by wear-

ing shoes and protective glasses. Clear area of debris and make sure young children and pets are indoors. While mowing, maintain awareness of the direction the mower is sending clippings. "Shooting objects can become like missiles and result in lacerations to bystanders," warns Dr. Lagerveld.

Botsford treats mower-related

injuries such as burns from touching or stepping too close to a hot machine. Remember to fuel the mower when cool, in an open area rather than an enclosed garage. And clean any spills before starting the machine.

Feet or hands that come in contact with moving blades can result in serious injuries. Dr. Lagerveld emphasizes to turn off machines

before attempting to unclog them. When encountering a hill with a push mower, cut at an angle to the slope. If the area is too steep, push mowers can roll backwards over the operator. On a riding mower, cut in a vertical direction up and down the slope. Roll-over incidents are especially prevalent when riding mowers tip and the operator is thrown off," he said.

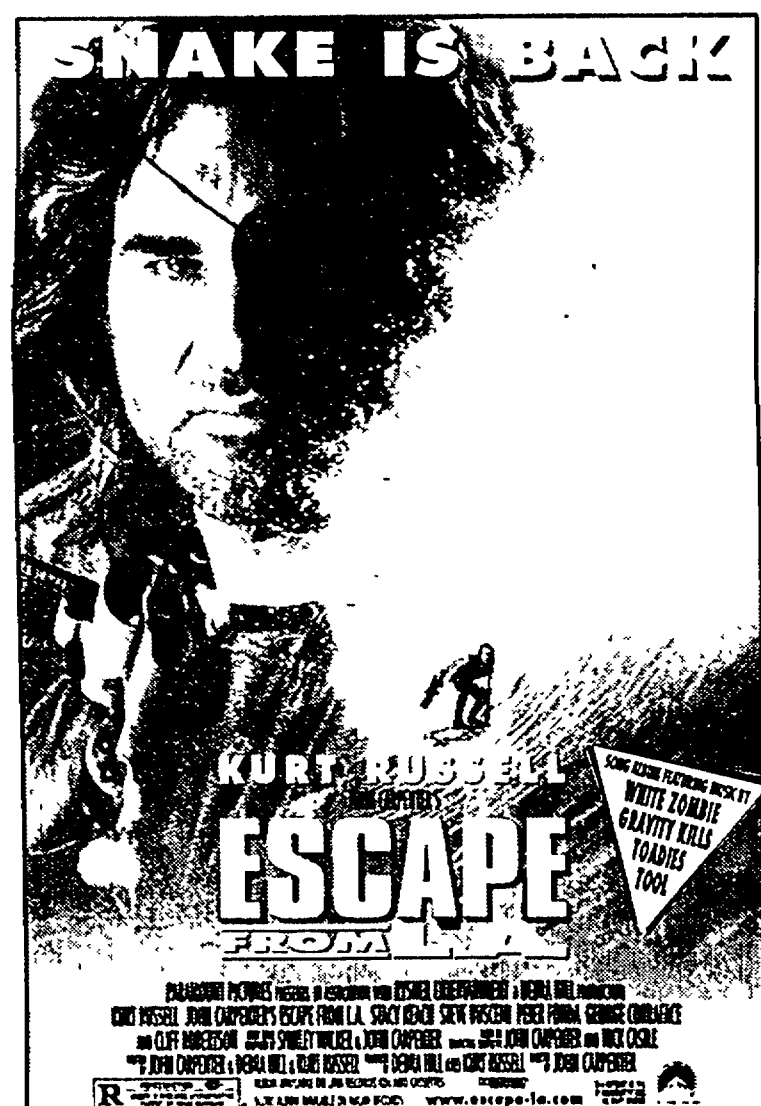

New York is the first team ever to win four straight NABF titles. But Mobile didn't make it easy.

Mobile did just that, winning the 9 a.m. game 6-4.

The game was tied at four heading into the sixth inning. With one out, the Bears' Albert Savage stepped in against New York's

One run was all Peavy needed. The Mobile hurler survived a tough first inning to pitch a complete game against the Yanks.

With his team's hopes on the line, Peavy was able to protect the lead. He allowed hits in both the sixth and seventh innings, but was able to work out of trouble and preserve the win.

That forced one final game. Having played five games in four days, both squads were visibly tired going into the championship contest.

New York's pitching corps was so tired, in fact, Seltzer had to improvise.

"The kids played their best two games of the year in the World Series," he added. "They came ready to play and it showed."

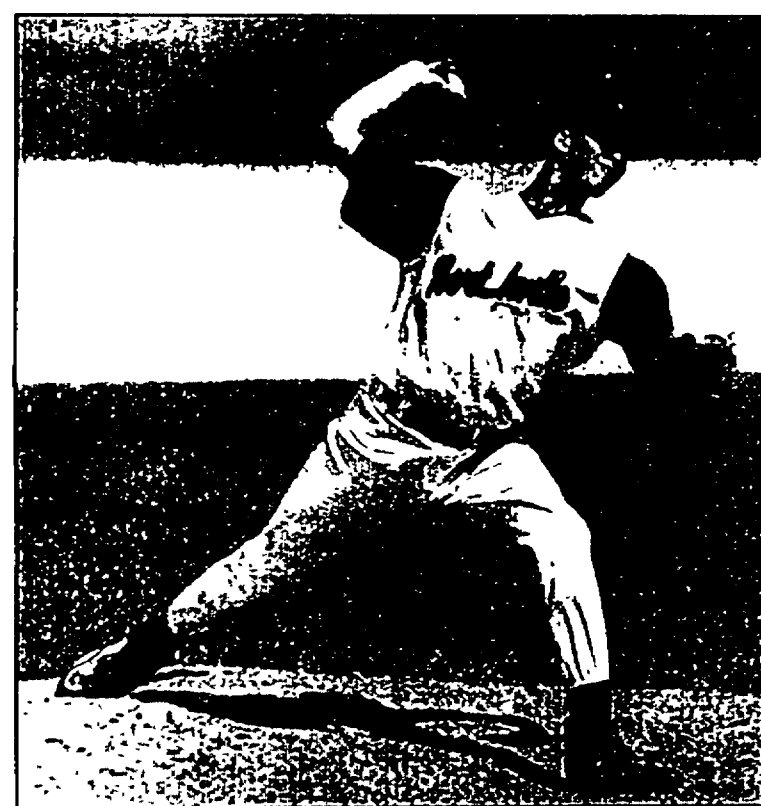
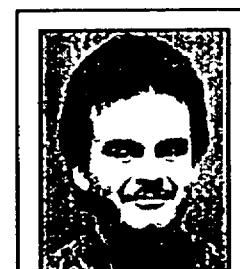

Northville player stars with Lakers

In a tournament where good pitching was the staple, the Kensington Valley Lakers baseball team picked a bad time to run out of arms.

The KV squad, made up of 18-and-under all-stars from the Kensington Valley Conference and surrounding areas, including Northville's Tom Willer, emerged as the top Michigan team at last weekend's American Amateur Baseball Congress North Regional tournament. But after getting good pitching throughout the tourney held at Battle Creek's Bailey Park, the Lakers just ran out of steam in the semifinal round going home for the summer after posting a 3-2 record in the event.

Adrian, the league champion, got a direct bid to the regional not having to battle its way through a dis-

trict tournament like KV. The Lakers got control early in the game and held Adrian off late, upsetting their old rivals 3-2.

Webberville's John Steiger kept the Adrian batters off balance for most of the game yielding just six hits and striking out 11 before holding on in the final two innings.

Kensington Valley scored all three of its runs in the third inning. 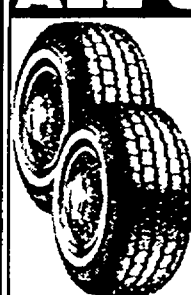

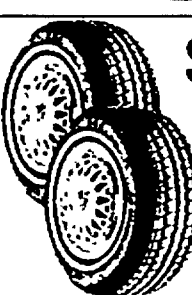

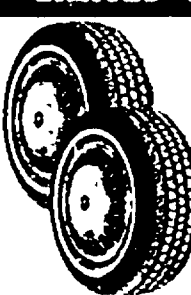

Copper Creek puts premium on accuracy

This week's Northville Record continues a series of weekly golf course reviews. Our focus is to provide you, the reader, useful information and tips on playing your favorite local courses.

For many golfers the idea of walking through a subdivision to get to the fourth tee isn't all that appealing.

The feeling of being away from life's hustle and bustle is lost on many of the courses designed as amenities for housing projects. It's hard, in other words, to concentrate on your shot as you hear Marge call little Johnny in for dinner.

Besides these distractions, the golfing typically isn't very good. Courses are often short, crude and unchallenging.

Fortunately, Copper Creek breaks that mold. Set in a mixed housing development in Farmington Hills, the 3,170-yard nine hole facility is real golf.

Yes, you still see plenty of decks and patios during your round. But each hole plays like any on some of the area's better public and private courses.

Spread over 74 acres, none of golf's nuances are lost on Copper Creek.

"You never have a ball come back at you," General Manager John Gwathney said about the course's layout. "You never see another golfer on the tee."

Copper Creek was built in 1991 just off Twelve Mile and Haggerty roads. Builder Stan Aldrich, who is

famous for restoring Indianwood

Country Club in Lake Orion, originally planned the course to be private and only to be used by folks living in adjacent homes.

Gwathney said those plans changed quickly.

"He decided it couldn't survive as

a private course," he added.

So the course opened in July of 1991 as a public facility. Since then, business has increased slowly. One of the main problems has been just letting golfers know that Copper Creek is there. Gwathney said.

"A lot of people still think it's private," he added.

Golfers who find their way to the links won't be disappointed. Copper Creek offers a solid layout that tests most clubs in your bag.

"It's a tight course," Gwathney said. "One of our best holes is No. 8. It's a par 3 that looks as if you're on an up-north course."

A look at the first hole tells

golfers they're in for a treat.

A 366-yard par 4 from the blue tees, golfers hit to a large, plush fairway. The green isn't visible from the tee on No. 1, but aim for the flag pole and you'll be in fine shape.

While the first hole is open, No. 2 is considerably narrower. A 389-yard dogleg right, golfers need to keep their shots in the fairway. A drive too far left or right will put their ball in the woods.

These two par 4's are typical of Copper Creek. Solid drives are required, but it isn't necessary to crush the ball 275 yards. If you are in the 200 to 230 range with your drives second shots won't be a

problem.

Par 3's at the course are far from gimmies.

The 164-yard fifth hole is an example. Golfers must avoid a large pond and hit a mid-sized green for a chance at birdie or par.

Rated as the toughest hole at Copper Creek, No. 7 is a 520-yard par 5. It fades off to the right and features a series of fairway bunkers. Long hitters may be able to reach this hole in two. If not, it's still a very good bet for par if you're on your game.

By far, the eighth hole is the course's prettiest.

At 180 yards, it's surrounded by trees. It does, indeed, feel like

you're in Gaylord or at some other northern Michigan venue.

Don't mislead your tee shot, either. A slice or hook won't be found in the thick wooded area.

Like many of Copper Creek's holes, the eighth green is in need of attention. In general, putting surfaces at the course are rough. Putting is difficult here because the quality of the green varies from hole to hole.

In all, though, Copper Creek is a bargain at \$14 for nine holes. Early birds can play for \$11 from 9 a.m. till noon Monday through Friday.

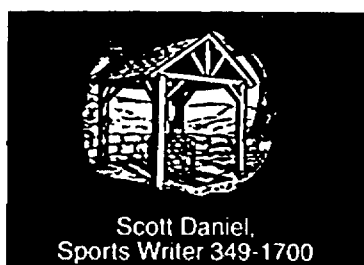

Well-child checkup key to health

"I don't take my child to the doctor because she's never sick."

Health care professionals often hear this comment but nevertheless we recommend, whether we're pediatricians, family practitioners or nurse practitioners, that every child have regular well-child checkups.

We make this recommendation because the well-child or health-maintenance exam provides a chance to review important issues that are not normally covered when a child sees a doctor for an illness like ear pain, a sore throat, coughing or vomiting. Instead of determining the cause of an illness and providing appropriate treatment, a well-child visit focuses on assessing growth and development, as well as behavioral concerns.

During a well-child visit, health care professionals usually spend more time with children

and parents than they do when a visit occurs because of illness. A well-child session will include measurements of height and weight, tests of vision and hearing, annual checks of blood pressure for children three or older, and for young children, assessments of progress in language development.

These visits also provide a chance to check for anemia and exposures to lead or tuberculosis. They also offer opportunities to discuss topics like diet, sleep, toilet training, tantrums, school and safety. For older children, they offer a chance to participate in discussions about school and home activities.

For children up to two, these visits are also tied closely to the schedule for childhood immunizations. Equally important for very young children are other procedures that take place during a well-child visit: monitoring normal growth and development and regular exams to confirm normal heart, lung, intentional and nervous systems. These visits normally take place every two to three months.

For children from ages two to six, health care professionals recommend yearly health maintenance exams. School-age children should have annual checkups at least every two years. Teenagers should have one every one to two

years. Children involved in sports may need a yearly physical. Young people with chronic medical conditions like asthma may also need to make an annual visit to their physician or nurse practitioner.

Parents should be aware that even school-age children and teenagers have immunization needs, and health-maintenance examinations are a good way to stay up-to-date. These immunizations include a second measles-mumps-rubella (MMR) vaccine, a tetanus booster and the hepatitis vaccine series. Vaccination against chicken pox is now also available. Some young children with chronic medical conditions may need to have a flu vaccine each fall.

The health maintenance examination provides a good opportunity to discuss your child's or teenager's immunization needs with your physician or nurse practitioner. Summer is a good time of year to take your old records in for review and to schedule that annual exam.

Home-building on the rise

This could be the best, most active year for home-building since 1988. And the hottest type of new housing in the current market is multifamily housing structures, with units designed for low- and middle-income families.

The increasing pace of home-building is keeping prices down to competitive levels. And with mortgage interest rates still low, many families and individuals are thinking this is the time to buy that first or second home.

"Americans are shrugging off this year's slightly higher mortgage rates," said Brian Bragg, editor of U.S. Housing Markets. "They're

buying homes because they like the feel of the economy, and they're buying at a rate that could push residential construction to its best year since 1988."

Bragg's publication, a noted housing research journal, calculates that builders will pull more than 1.44 million permits for new houses, condos and apartments this year. The projected total would be the best since builders took out nearly 1.5 million residential permits eight years ago.

The most active areas of the country for home-building are in Mississippi and the Rocky Mountain states, the publication said.

But the current pace of multi-

If the kids have left the nest, you can do a lot of different things with these spaces. Maybe a guest room, home office or television room.

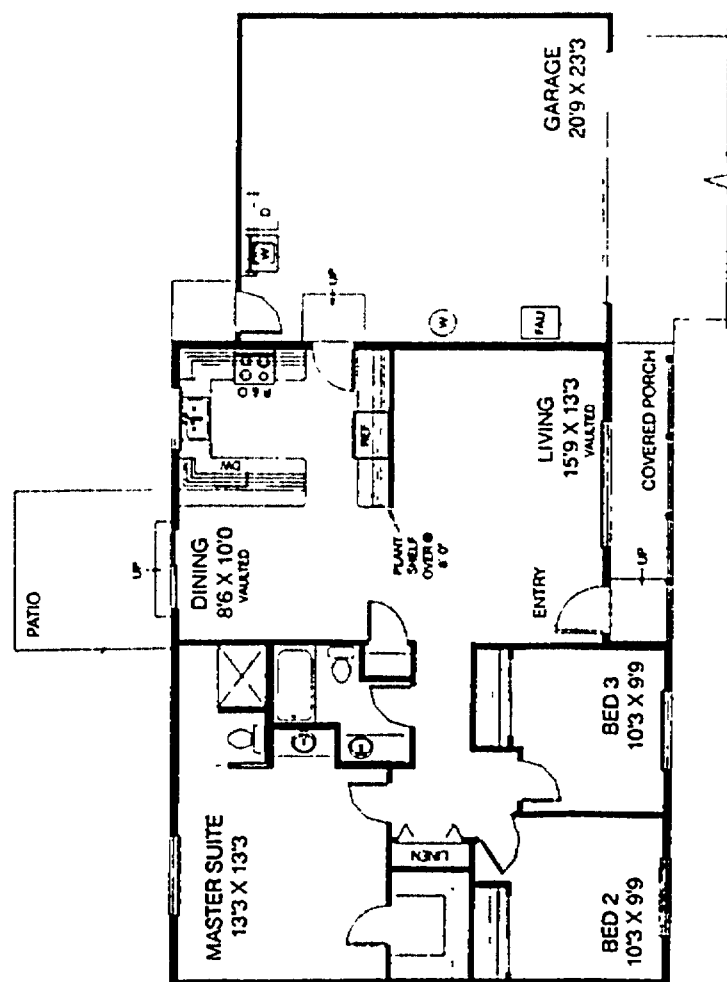
The generous master suite is well-placed and has amenities that include a huge walk-in closet, private bathroom and vanity.

Who among us hasn't been transfixed by the lively dance of a fountain or the gentle cascade of a waterfall? The sights and sounds of moving water captivate and relax, offering respite, however brief, from our hectic world.

For most of us, our encounters with fountains or waterfalls are limited. Not so for Frank and Carol Dziabuda. All the Deerfield Township couple has to do is step out their front door and they are greeted by the glorious sights and sounds of a waterfall.

Designed and installed by EPG Nurseries in Howell, the Dziabudas' tiered waterfall is the focal point of their breathtaking front yard garden.

The waterfall, situated to the left of the Dziabudas' yard, takes advantage of a natural slope in the terrain. Water cascades over rocks from tiered pools down to a narrow rock-lined channel.

From there, it flows under a miniature footbridge to a large pond located down in the side yard. The water is then pumped back up the hill, through tubing that has been buried, to the top pond, where the process begins again.

Edged with rocks and planted with grasses, flowering shrubs and perennials, the waterfall is, quite simply, stunning.

The Dziabudas, who own Unique Style Home Builders, find the waterfall very relaxing after a hectic day and are able to enjoy it even in the evening from the screened-in front porch of their Victorian-inspired home.

"It's prettiest in the early morning or in the evening," says Carol Dziabuda.

A waterfall or fountain can be designed and constructed by a landscaper, or you can do it yourself.

For the most part, in order to have a fountain and/or waterfall, you'll first need to install a pond (some fountains that don't require a pond setting are available in garden catalogs).

But before doing any digging,

The prime time to harvest

Deciding when to harvest your vegetables and fruit is just as important as any other decision you make concerning your garden. It would be a shame to get great seeds, properly water and fertilize, and watch over your bounty only to ruin your harvest because you picked too early or late. Follow the procedures below, and you won't be kicking yourself later.

Corn. Corn is ready to eat when the silks have dried to within 1 inch of the tips of the ears and the kernels in the third row down from the top squirt a milky (rather than clear) juice when pressed with your thumb.

Tomatoes. Should be picked just as they begin to change from orange to red. Keep them at 59 to 70 degrees in normal room light (no sunny windowsills) for four or five days until they finish ripening to full red.

Of course, you should never put tomatoes in the refrigerator. Temperatures below 50 degrees in the fridge change the aroma volatiles that are major components of a tomato's flavor.

Melons. Cantaloupes and most other melons prefer to tell you when they're ready to

be picked — so learn their language. Look for an unusually long stem with a small leaf where the vine joins the melon. When the melon is ripe, that small leaf will be paler than all the other leaves on the vine. Most melons are referred to as slip-type by growers because the melon separates (slips) from the vine as it ripens. Most of the melons you see in supermarkets are picked at the quarter-slip stage when the contact point between the vine and the melon is a quarter of the way dried.

However, home gardeners should wait until their melons reach the full-slip stage when the contact between melon and vine is completely dried and the melon lifts away from the vine without any tugging.

Beans. Start harvesting your patch when the bean seeds just begin to show through the first pods, then pick at least every other day after that to make sure no beans get too mature. Pick string beans first thing in the morning because if you wait until afternoon or evening you may get soft, limp beans.

Peas. Pick your peas before

When to harvest

■ **Corn:** Pick when the silks have dried to within one-half inch of the ears and when the third row of kernels from the top squirt out a milky juice when squeezed.
■ **Tomatoes:** Pick when they change from orange to red.
■ **Melons:** Harvest when the stem between melon and vine is

dry and no tugging is required.
■ **Beans:** Pick when the beans are just beginning to show through the pod's skin.

■ **Peas:** Harvest before the top of the pod dries out completely. The pod will be fat and the stem will have white powder on it. Do not let beans and peas overripen.

■ **Carrots:** Judge these root vegetables by color. Scratch a bit of dirt away to check them.

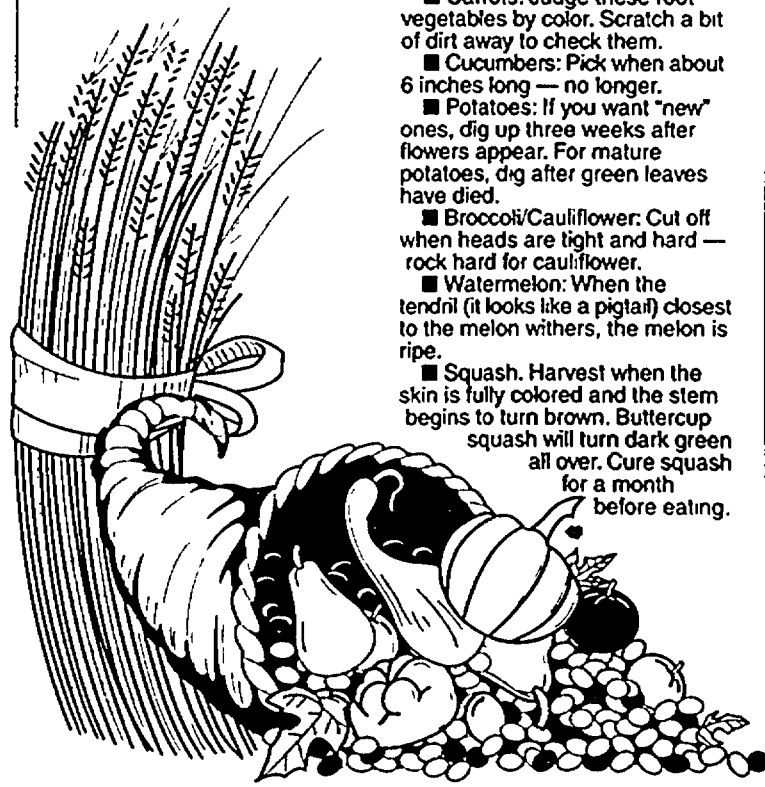
■ **Cucumbers:** Pick when about 6 inches long — no longer.

■ **Potatoes:** If you want "new" ones, dig up three weeks after flowers appear. For mature potatoes, dig after green leaves have died.

■ **Broccoli/Cauliflower:** Cut off when heads are tight and hard — rock hard for cauliflower.

■ **Watermelon:** When the tendril (it looks like a pigtail) closest to the melon withers, the melon is ripe.

■ **Squash.** Harvest when the skin is fully colored and the stem begins to turn brown. Buttercup squash will turn dark green all over. Cure squash for a month before eating.

Home-construction on the increase; FHA loan changes

family housing construction may not last long, according to Urban Land Institute (ULI). Because construction is up, rent increases in many markets are not expected to be as strong as last year. Thus, economic incentives for builders-developers may decline.

As for single-family home construction, activity has been picking up since the fall of last year. And 1996 is shaping up to be a particularly good year for single-family home construction, ULI reported.

The Realtors Information Network (RIN), the recently launched computerized information system structured by a subsidiary of the National Association of Realtors, is

getting mixed reviews by realtors throughout the country.

RIN contains a huge database of available properties nationwide, drawing in listed property descriptions from regional multiple listing service (MLS) operations.

A description of this new high-tech system has been carried in past columns, along with positive statements about its usefulness from RIN and NAR leaders. I've been communicating with Realtors throughout the country on computer on-line systems, candidly discussing the merits of RIN among other subjects.

One realtor, a broker-manager of a Re/Max franchised office in San Jose, Calif., said:

"In a nutshell, RIN is a \$13 million boondoggle. It has been misrepresented as

being 'state of the art' and I know of no evidence that it really works.

"It uses proprietary standards instead of generic standards. It seems that realtors, at least in most parts of California, see it as a flawed and expensive concept. Where it is operational, there seems to have been an expensive dose of realtor politics at work."

9. Are FHA home loans about to be changed?

A home financing loan insured by the Federal Housing Administration (FHA) will change significantly if currently proposed legislation passes.

The new law would greatly simplify down-payment calculation, provide FHA with more flexibility in setting mortgage

insurance premium structures, allow for new development of new products, permit lenders to directly issue insurance endorsements, ease rules for new construction and reform the claims process.

The draft bill goes a long way toward addressing many of FHA's priorities discussed over the past 3 years, but it falls short of proposing that the agency be "reinvented" as some sort of public corporation, according to a report in "Inside Mortgage Finance" newsletter.

FHA officials hope to have the legislation introduced within the next couple of months.

9. You occasionally report on corporate transferees — executives and their families moving from one city to another. How many of those transferees are women?

A. The proportion of women transferees has been increasing for some time. Twenty-five percent of all transferees are women, according to the research firm of Runzheimer International.

The report also noted that 12 percent of transferees are now ethnic minorities and 5 percent are single parents. The percent of women transferees has increased from 22 percent in 1994 and 16 percent in 1993.

Knowing the right time to harvest your garden produce

the top of the pod dries out completely. The pod should look fat and the stem end will have a few small white flakes or a light powdery coating on it. Open one or more pods and look at the peas before you

pick the whole crop. If the peas are small and irregularly shaped, they're just not ready. When they're plump and nicely round, they're perfect.

Carrots. A carrot's color is the best way to know when it's ripe. For instance, if it's pale orange, it's not sweet enough. How

can you tell the color of a carrot that's growing underground? I say scratch a bit of soil away around the top of one side of the carrot. It doesn't hurt the carrot at all.

Cucumbers. The best measure of a ripe cucumber is its size. Slicing cukes should be picked when they are about 6 inches long and firm; pickers get picked at about 4 to 5 inches. Don't let them get bigger than that because left on the vine too long a cucumber gets mushy, fat and seedy. If you see yellow on them at all — the boat has sailed!

Potatoes. Those growing underground will be tasty and big enough to eat three weeks after their above-ground flowers first appear; these are the tender little spuds home gardeners call new potatoes. For bigger, heart-

ier ones, wait to dig until the above-ground green leaves die back at the end of the season. Be very careful when digging up potatoes, especially the tender young ones, because they don't store properly if at all wounded. If you do happen to cut or scratch more than you can eat all at once, simply store damaged spuds in a jar of water in the fridge until you can eat them.

Squash. Be patient with your winter squash — wait until the skin is fully colored and the stem begins to turn brown instead of green. Buttercup varieties will turn dark-green all over — no light-green spots left at all when they are ready to be harvested.

Once your winter squash are fully matured, I recommend removing them from the vine and curing them a month or so before eating. Put them in a cool, dark spot where they can finish ripening and

sweetening up.

Broccoli and cauliflower. Pick the flower heads while they are still tight and hard for broccoli, and rock hard for cauliflower, to get full flavor and firm texture. If you're not going to put the heads right into the pot or freezer, immerse the stem end in a pitcher of water and keep it in the fridge until you're ready to eat it. Treat it like a cut flower. This way, a cauliflower or broccoli can be kept in good eating condition for a week or more.

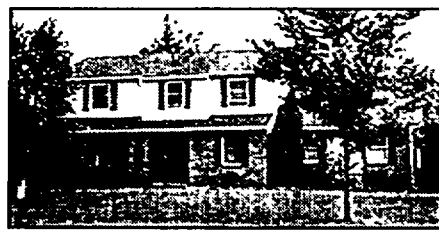
Watermelon. There is a tendril right where the stem of the melon joins the vine (looks like a little pigtail); when that tendril withers, your watermelon is ready to be harvested.

You can try all of your other tricks — tap or thump — but until that tendril dries out, the watermelon is not ready. I like to give my melons a thump to be sure

The magic of a waterfall or fountain

check with your local township or city for zoning regulations regarding the depth of ponds. Some areas may require yard fencing to prevent accidents with children.

In terms of location, design and installation considerations, it is advisable to take time to do research prior to beginning the project. Good sources of information are landscaping companies or nurseries that specialize in water gardens, some garden centers, as well as your local library.

In addition to the pond, the most important ingredient in creating the magic of a fountain or a waterfall is a pump.

The benefit of the pump is two-fold, says Jim Peters of EPG Nurseries. Not only does the pump provide the visual effect of the waterfall or fountain, it also aerates the water and keeps it cleaner.

For a pump to be effective in feeding a waterfall or fountain, it must generate enough pressure to force water to the discharge point.

Submersible pumps are the best choice for ponds because they can be set in the water, they are relatively inexpensive and, since they are underwater, noiseless.

Most pumps use 110 volt (your regular house current), and can be plugged in to an outdoor outlet, says Peters. The pump that he installed in the Dziabudas' pond is quite large because it circulates a lot of water and as such an electrician was brought in to wire a 200 volt outlet.

It is recommended that a ground fault circuit interrupter (GFCI) is installed by a licensed electrician. A GFCI will shut off the power to the pump if the cord is worn, accidentally cut or there is an electrical surge. Also find out if any electrical work needs to be inspected by your local building inspector.

When choosing a pump, several factors have to be considered. You will need to determine what size pump is required by calculating the volume of your pool. The pump should be able to circulate at least half of the pond water per hour, or the complete pond every two hours.

According to "Garden Pools & Fountains" by Edward Claflin, to calculate the volume of a pool, multiply the length by the width and height (in inches) to give the number of

cubic inches. Then you divide that amount by 231, which is the number of cubic inches in a gallon of water.

Following that equation, the volume of a pool measuring 72 inches wide by 96 inches long and 18 inches deep is 538.5. To recirculate the half the pond in an hour, the pump should have a rated capacity of about 300 gallons per hour.

In addition, you will have to consider how far the water will be pumped. Generally speaking, the greater the distance the water has to travel (such as to feed a waterfall), the more the pump's performance is reduced. Narrow piping will also affect the pump's performance.

Claflin writes, "Buy a pump that is more powerful than you think you will need; you can always slow it down, but you can't make a weak pump work harder."

Fountains are fairly easy to install because they are sold as kits that include a submersible pump, filter and a fountain head. There are a variety of fountain heads to choose from, including one-, two- or three-tier sprays, mushroom sprays, tulip sprays or fountain heads with several adjustable spray patterns. For a more ornamental look, the water can be diverted through a statue or sculpture.

Other recommendations made by Claflin:

When selecting a fountain head, keep in mind the height of the spray should be in relation to the size of the pool. A large spray in a small pool not only looks out of proportion, it also causes the water in the pond to dissipate quickly as the spray can blow outside the edges of the pond.

In designing a waterfall, remember the placement of stones can

change the way the water moves and sounds. To create a desired effect, experiment with different sizes and different placement of stones. Small pebbles scattered in a shallow area will produce a ripple effect. Large, flat stones extended over the edge of the fall will produce a translucent sheet of water. The key is to experiment and have fun.

When adding plants to the pond, also keep in mind that aquatic plants, like water lilies, do not tolerate splashing or rushing water and, as such, should be located in an area of calm water.

Whether your water garden setting features an elaborate, multi-tiered waterfall or a simple bubbling fountain, they're sure to provide the same effect: a healthy dose of tranquility.

Starting over with Arbor Hospice

It all begins with a trip to northern Michigan on a sunny Friday morning. The fear is palpable as strangers gather to carpool to an unknown destination. Many have come reluctantly; filled with apprehension. Once on the freeway, conversations develop and continue non-stop until the caravan reaches its final destination.

This select group of metro-Detroiters is made up of men and women ranging in age from 28-45 who have recently become widows and widowers. They are headed to a weekend retreat away from children and jobs and, for most, the first time away since they suddenly became single. The participants have been introduced through a support group called "Starting Over," which is one of many ongoing bereavement groups sponsored by the Arbor Hospice.

Soon after arriving at the remote cottage, everyone heads outside to admire the breathtaking view of the lake and peaceful surroundings. Many become subdued and tearful, reminiscing about times spent at similar places with the ones they loved and lost. It's obvious that many are beginning to wonder what they could possibly have been thinking when they agreed to participate in this weekend.

Fortunately, dinner time arrives,

and everyone heads to a country restaurant to enjoy an evening meal, unencumbered by the demands of children or the routine of eating alone. People start relaxing and even enjoying themselves, discovering that they have more in common with each other than they initially thought.

Once back at the cottage, the idea of sharing their grief with these new acquaintances elicits in many anxiety and, once again, a desire to escape. Sharing one's grief can be a painful, but important part of the recovery process. Pictures of young husbands and wives emerge as a person tells a story of terminal illness, automobile accidents, heart attacks, and even murder.

As one father passes a picture of his young wife in the hospital birthing room, he explains what a wonderful mother she was for too short a time. Another young woman shares her shattered dreams of having a baby with her athletic husband whose heart stopped during a workout. Each story and each person's pain is unique. The dialog continues well into the night.

Saturday finds the group at Sleeping Bear Dunes for an invigorating and therapeutic dune climb. Small groups break away continuing the discussions of the previous night and as the day meanders so

do the groups. Intimate discussions, moments of laughter, moments of hope, flashbacks of sorrow, moments promising better days to come.

Dinner and a bonfire. Could this be the same group that hardly knew each other last night? These people are laughing and talking about the events of the day. No one is in a hurry to end this night.

As departure time nears, no one wants to leave. Phone numbers are exchanged, plans are being made for future get-togethers, and the huge and well wishes are plentiful. Prior retreats indicate that some of the friendships formed this weekend will last a lifetime. The weekend was a success.

Breaking down the barriers of communication is the first step in the grief recovery process. Realizing that others are experiencing pain and problems similar to one's own can be the emotional release that precipitates the healing process. Often, young widows and widowers feel even more isolated by their youth. It is the purpose of "Starting Over" to bring these individuals together and provide a safe and comfortable forum for them to share their experiences and find ways of overcoming their grief.
