Drunk driving incidents drop

The city's ongoing campaign to keep drivers safe and sober also seems to be having the desired effect on motorists' decisions to drink and drive, according to statistics released by the Northville Police Department.

Police Chief Rod Cannon said statistics for the first quarter of 1996 showed a dramatic drop in drunk driving arrests - a 46 percent decrease from the same period last year.

Only 13 people were arrested for drunk driving, or operating a vehicle under the influence (OUI) in Northville from January to April

That's 15 fewer arrests from the same time frame in 1995, a year in which police made a near record number of drunk driving arrests.

Cannon said the department has increased its efforts to heighten public awareness of the dangers of drinking and driving and that, coupled with stepped up patrols on area streets, has had some positive impact.

"The message has been communicated well by various agencies within the community and it's a positive sign that the community is getting more involved," Cannon said. "Our officers have also worked hard in getting the message out and the continued patrol presence has

been a great deterrent."

Threatened suit becomes reality

After two years on the back burner, the long running controversy over the Woods of Edenderry and its road connections is heating up again.

Cambridge Development, the Northville based backer of the Woods subdivision, filed a lawsuit last week against Northville Township in Wayne County Circuit Court. Mark and Eric Guidobono, brothers and partners in Cambridge, want a judge to end the stalemate that's hampered their efforts to complete the Woods since 1993.

First proposed in the early spring of that year, the Woods of Edenderry is a 100 lot sub slated for 78 acres of land on Six Mile just west of Sheldon road. Phase one, which includes the southern section of the parcel and about two thirds of the lots, won township approval that fall.

It's phase two, which includes questions of road connections, that's been the stumbling block ever since. Encompassing the northern section of the Woods and about the southern end of the quiet neighborhood of homes

Bond committee prepares for push

Group maps strategy in try for \$61 million plan

A group of Northville residents is planning to spend the next six weeks convincing voters to approve a \$61 million school district bond issue, and they are optimistic about their chances.

The group, Continuing Excellence for Northville Children (CENC), met for the first time last week and unveiled some of the strategies they will use to "get the word out" about the bond issue.

"I think our best approach is to identify our supporters and get them out to the polls to vote," said CENC Chairman Jerry Rupley. "Then I think we need to look at those who are possible supporters and ensure they understand the issue. If people realize and understand the tremendous amount of work the community put into these issues, I think they will find it appropriate to support the bond."

More than 30 people attended the meeting, including school district Superintendent Leonard Reznierski, Finance Director John Street, and school board Vice President Joan Wadsworth.

The issue goes before voters Sept. 23 and is the culmination of about three years of study by various district committees. At stake is the construction of a new high

school and renovation work for the remaining school facilities. New technology is also included in the package.

According to Mary Rupley, who heads CENC's research and analysis subcommittee, adding on to the existing high school facility is not an option.

"You could never remodel that school enough to adequately address the future needs of students," she said. Mary was a member of the district's Bond and High School Futures committees.

According to a district proposed bond cost summary, \$48 million will be spent on the construction of the new high school. The conversion of the current high school and other school upgrades have been estimated at \$11 million with an additional \$5.2 million in

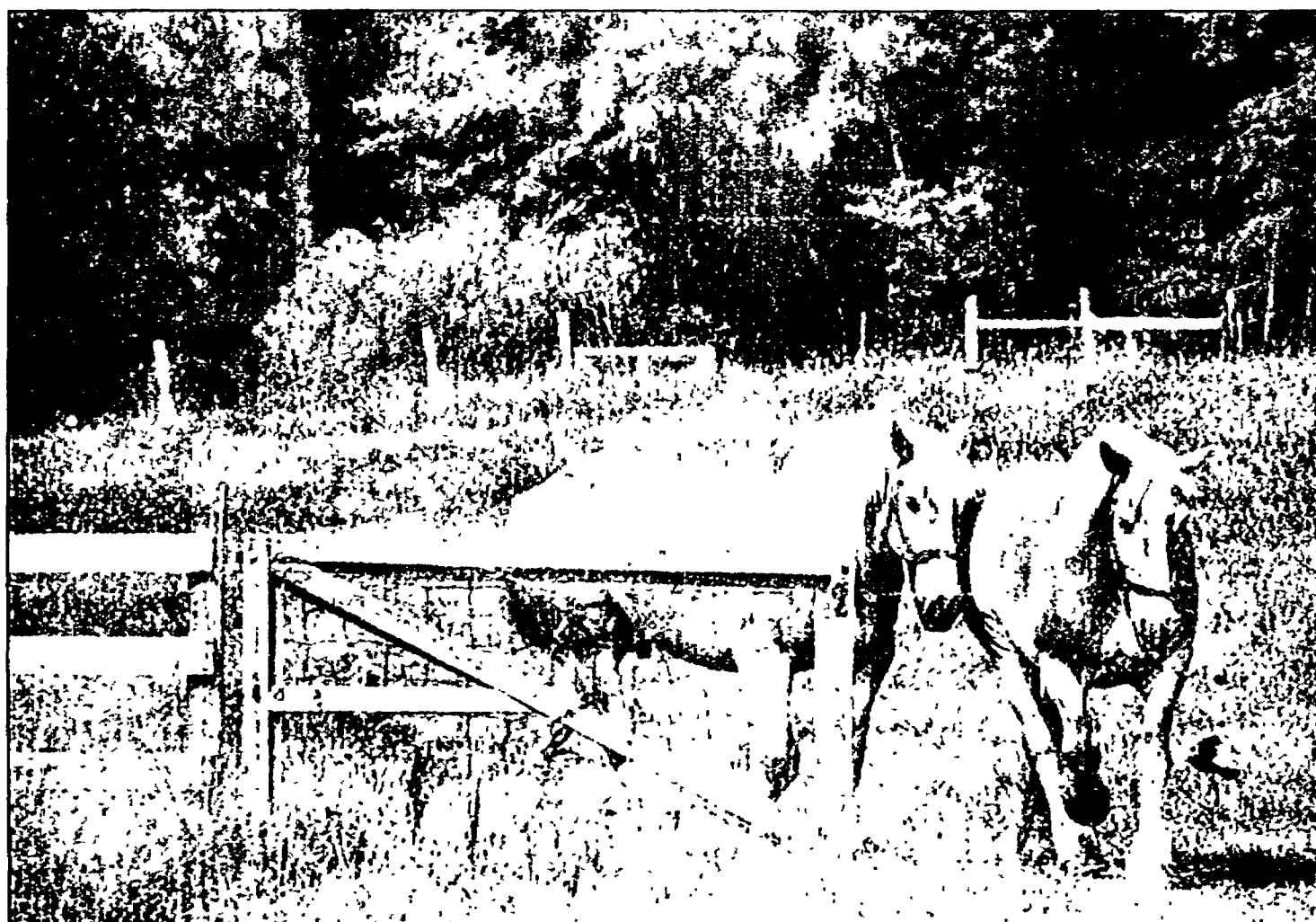

City hall facelift recommendation forwarded to decision makers

Northville City Hall will have a new look sometime within the next year if the city council approves the recommendation of a citizens committee.

According to Assistant City Manager Nickie Bateson, the municipal building renovation committee is finalizing its recommendations on the future of city hall and plans to submit them to council members for possible approval sometime

in September.

"We're just working on the final wording of the recommendation and could possibly have it finalized when the committee meets next week," Bateson said.

Chairman Jerry Mittman said he was pleased with the work of the committee and that, despite differences among several members, the recommendation was a unanimous one.

"All 10 of us had different ideas about the project, and we discussed a lot of

issues," he said. "I think the recommendation that we send the council will be appropriate."

City officials say that approximately \$1.4 million in renovations are needed for the city hall facility. Most of those renovations must be made to bring the facility into line with the Federal Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

The city has missed the ADA deadline and non-compliance could bring about a costly lawsuit, placing the city and its tax

payers in a pretty unappealing financial situation, according to Bateson.

"Not complying at this point would be considered a civil rights violation," she said. "If somebody were to come into our building and find it unacceptable by ADA standards, they would have the means to seek damages or enter into some type of litigation that could force the city into compliance."

The ADA deadline was Jan. 26, 1995, and the requirement to bring city hall up

to standard forced city officials to move the renovation project to the top of their priority list.

Also to be considered is an expansion of the fire hall, as well as the possible move of the city council meeting room into where the library is currently housed. That move would free up necessary office space on the facility's main floor, officials maintain.

The renovation committee is scheduled to meet at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, Aug. 20, in the Senior Citizens Center, 215 W. Carly

Incumbents offer explanations of election loss

The incumbents on the Northville Township Board of Trustees who won't be back come November have very different takes on why they lost last week and what will come next.

Supervisor Karen Baja and Trustee Gini Britton, running for slots on the board as trustee and treasurer in the lightly-attended Aug. 6 Republican primary, came up short. Baja wound up in last place among the five GOP candidates contending for the four open trustee seats, trailing her closest competitor by more than 800 votes.

Britton, meanwhile, lost her bid to become the new township treasurer by more than 300 votes to Dick Henningsen, the man who once held the job for more than a decade.

Their views of why they did not

succeed differ.

"I didn't campaign hard enough," Britton said. "I assumed that honesty, integrity and a record of hard work were enough."

A better effort would have included such tactics as more door-to-door canvassing for votes and additional political lawn signs, she added.

As for what she'll do after the new board is elected Nov. 5, Britton said she isn't sure yet.

"I don't know what's coming next," she stated. Baja, on the other hand, put the blame for her defeat squarely on *The Northville Record*.

"The paper butchered my reputation most effectively," she said. "The paper's done that to the last three female supervisors."

"You've not just disagreed with each of us politically but on a per-

people from drinking and driving. "Overall it's been a collective effort by everyone and that's been instrumental in combating the problem," he said.

Cannon added that officers have been less tolerant of traffic violations, including drinking and driving and failing to use safety belts.

He said that patrol officers will continue to be aggressive in citing drivers for offenses, and he hopes the combined actions of the department and the community will keep drunk driving numbers on the downward path.

"We plan to continue with our programs, and maintaining our good relationships with the com-

munity and various agencies," he concluded. "This unified approach has shown positive results."

The quarterly police report also showed an decrease in the number

of larcenies reported within the first four months - from 43 reported during the same period last year to 32 this year - and an increase in the number of traffic

accidents from 89 in 1995 to 95 in 1996.

Northville police officers wrote more traffic tickets during the first quarter - 874 tickets this year as opposed to 821 last year - and more parking citations - 1,757 citations this year compared to

1,326 during the same period last year.

Police officers also logged 39,753 miles on the road, spent 147 hours in court, received 528 hours of training, and used 256 hours of sick time - all slight increases over the same period last year.

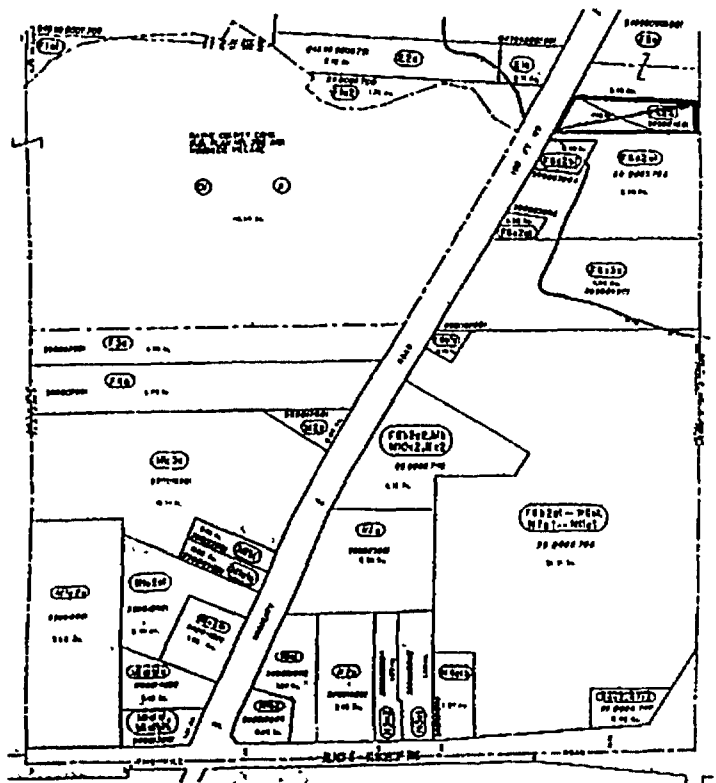

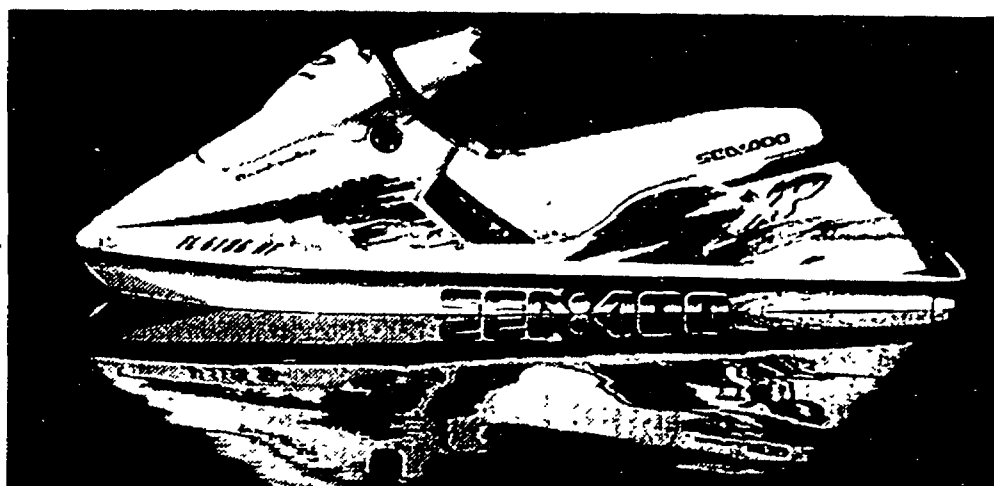

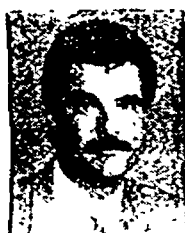

Wild car crash puts driver in hospital

A 45-year-old Northville man is in serious condition after a three-car accident Aug. 10.

According to police the man was driving east on Eight Mile Road and when he went through the intersection at Taft Road, he momentarily lost control of his vehicle and traveled across the center line.

When the man regained control the vehicle jerked back into the eastbound lane and struck a second car driven by a 51-year-old Northville woman.

The car then continued, striking a third vehicle before hitting a road sign just west of Randolph Street.

Police and Emergency Medical personnel responded immediately and found the man unconscious. He was transported to St. Mary

Hospital, where he was listed in critical condition.

Police have no idea how the man lost control of his vehicle. Nobody else was injured in the crash.

NO SIGN OF THIEF: No one in the elevator and nothing left in the jewelry drawer.

That about sums up a daylight burglary that occurred at a Northville Township woman's home on Aug. 5.

According to police the woman, 75, left her residence at about 9:30 a.m. that day. She returned at 2:30 p.m. to find her front door open.

The woman then left, driving to get her son, who returned with her and checked the interior of the house.

No one was found, despite the

son's hope that the perpetrator might have been stuck between floors in a service elevator in the home. Some \$300 in cash and more than \$11,000 in jewelry is missing.

DOMESTIC PROBLEM: A township woman called police on the evening of Aug. 4, reporting that her ex-boyfriend was severely harassing her.

According to witnesses the man, 32, banged on her door then climbed onto the woman's balcony to get into her residence. He was gone when police arrived.

The woman, 31, told the reporting officers in the case she had dated the Detroit resident for about five months but that the

relationship had ended. When contacted by police the man admitted to scaling the balcony but only because he "had been trying to see her all day."

The man was notified by letter that he will face charges if he engages in such alleged behavior again.

The woman said she plans to seek a personal protection order from a judge forbidding him to contact her. A second woman has such an order against the man now.



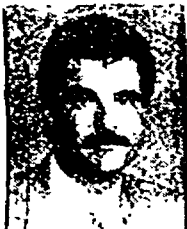

Wild car crash puts driver in hospital

A 45-year-old Northville man is in serious condition after a three-car accident Aug. 10.

According to police the man was driving east on Eight Mile Road and when he went through the intersection at Taft Road, he momentarily lost control of his vehicle and traveled across the center line.

When the man regained control the vehicle jerked back into the eastbound lane and struck a second car driven by a 51-year-old Northville woman.

The car then continued, striking a third vehicle before hitting a road sign just west of Randolph Street.

Police and Emergency Medical personnel responded immediately and found the man unconscious. He was transported to St. Mary

Hospital, where he was listed in critical condition.

Police have no idea how the man lost control of his vehicle. Nobody else was injured in the crash.

NO SIGN OF THIEF: No one in the elevator and nothing left in the jewelry drawer.

That about sums up a daylight burglary that occurred at a Northville Township woman's home on Aug. 5.

According to police the woman, 75, left her residence at about 9:30 a.m. that day. She returned at 2:30 p.m. to find her front door open.

The woman then left, driving to get her son, who returned with her and checked the interior of the house.

No one was found, despite the

son's hope that the perpetrator might have been stuck between floors in a service elevator in the home. Some \$300 in cash and more than \$11,000 in jewelry is missing.

DOMESTIC PROBLEM: A township woman called police on the evening of Aug. 4, reporting that her ex-boyfriend was severely harassing her.

According to witnesses the man, 32, banged on her door then climbed onto the woman's balcony to get into her residence. He was gone when police arrived.

The woman, 31, told the reporting officers in the case she had dated the Detroit resident for about five months but that the

relationship had ended. When contacted by police the man admitted to scaling the balcony but only because he "had been trying to see her all day."

The man was notified by letter that he will face charges if he engages in such alleged behavior again.

The woman said she plans to seek a personal protection order from a judge forbidding him to contact her. A second woman has such an order against the man now.



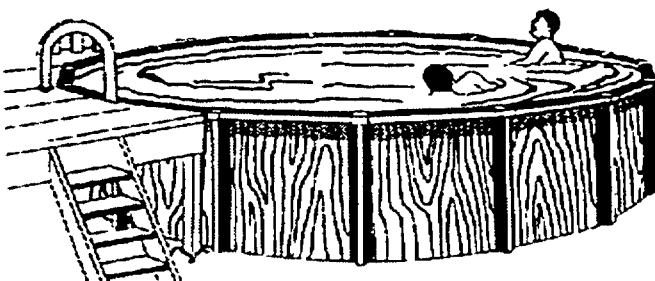

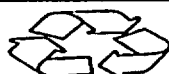

Township Briefs

News from the Aug. 8 meeting of the Northville Township Board of Trustees:

CABLE BOXES A PAIN: Many township residents are having problems with cable television equipment boxes these days, and members of the board say they want to see what can be done about it.

That's not likely to add up to much, however. According to township attorney Chris Koch, the federal Telecommunications Act severely restricts local municipalities' ability to regulate the operations of cable companies.

Board members asked about putting cable boxes underground or seeing if companies could share boxes. The companies, township Manager Tamara Hanlin said, rejected both ideas.

PUBLIC HEARINGS SET: The board voted to hold public hearings on two rezoning proposals next month.

Thursday, Sept. 12, is the date for members of the public to tell trustees what they think of plans concerning the Oasis Family Fun Center and Harbor Hills. The Oasis is seeking to have part of its property off Five Mile near Haggerty rezoned from OS-1 (office/service district) to B-3 (general business district).

Harbor Hills is a senior citizens' housing complex proposed for a parcel of land on the north side of Seven Mile near the Northville Plaza mall. For the complex to be built the board must agree to rezone the land from R-3 (single family residential housing district) to RE (elderly housing residential district).

DEPUTY CLERK SOUGHT: Township Clerk Sue Hillebrand is looking for a new full-time deputy clerk.

The township's longtime deputy clerk, Eunice Switzer, retired early this year and Hillebrand has taken over the duties of the office ever since. Now she's beginning the process of finding a new deputy. The job will pay up to \$30,000 a year. Call Hillebrand at 348-5800 for more information.

QUAD SUMMIT MEETING: Members of the board, the Northville City Council, the Northville Board of Education and the Northville Chamber of Commerce will meet in a joint session Aug. 21. The meeting is to promote discussion about issues affecting all of Northville and will begin at 7 p.m. at Thornton Creek Elementary School, located on Nine Mile between Taft and Beck roads in Novi.

Finance officer sought

Wanted: One financial expert willing and able to help direct the fiscal operations of a white collar city.

Northville city officials started their search for a new assistant finance director this week.

At the same time the Northville City Council has approved the restructuring of the treasurer/assessor position, contracting out the tax assessment function to a Wayne County appraisal company, Glenn Shaw and Associates.

City administrators will be processing applications and resumes for the position, vacated by Mark Christiansen who left to work for the city of Plymouth last month.

The restructuring will not cost the city any additional funds, according to Assistant City Manager Nickle Bateson.

"We anticipate that the city could contract with the Wayne County assessment firm and hire the assistant finance director/treasurer position with no increase in budgeted amounts in current or future years," she explained.

The new administrator will be paid between \$33,000 to \$36,000 annually, according to Bateson.

Christiansen had performed all three functions for the city. He left Northville after the completion of the budget in July to take the finance director/assessor position in Plymouth.

City officials expect the new position to be filled sometime this fall.

technology upgrade costs also included.

Under state law, bond proceeds cannot be used for maintenance costs, teacher, administrator or employee salaries, fringe benefits or other operating systems.

The total package will cost taxpayers \$61 million, an estimated increase of 2.35 mills.

The life of the bond will run somewhere between 20 and 30 years, depending on market conditions.

CENC member Robin Polletta said the bond issue is necessary to accommodate continuing growth.

"We're growing because our reputation as a bedroom community with quality schools is a magnet to people coming from out of state, and from other metro-Detroit communities," she said.

According to Jerry Rupley the committee plans to conduct informal get-togethers, such as coffee meetings, to target potential supporters.

"We think that once people understand how much research and work went into this entire process they will support the bond," he said.

The group will also embark on a phone campaign to try to reach about 4,000 households.

"We know that flyers and leaflets don't work because people lose them or they're misplaced," member Tom Barry said. "We will utilize the phones and talk to people about the benefits of the issue."

Heinz, Romney have convention roles

Folks in Michigan missed it on network television, but a couple of familiar voices addressed the Republican National Convention here Monday.

Ronna Romney, Bloomfield Hills party worker and U.S. Senate nominee, and Susy Heintz, former Northville, Novi and Birmingham resident now running for Congress in Macomb County, had a few minutes apiece in the sun at midday (Pacific time) before a sparsely-filled convention hall.

"Lots of fund-raising," Romney answered when asked what she was doing at the conclave. "Women don't usually have the network to raise money."

"They let me speak at the convention. We had to submit our text last Friday. Then I had to practice with a Teleprompter. I had never used a Teleprompter," said the former GOP national committeewoman and veteran radio broadcaster.

"I've been at events," said Heintz, a former Wayne County commissioner, chief of Gov. Engler's Detroit office and state party chair. "We heard Newt (Speaker Newt Gingrich) at GOPAC, the Susan B. Anthony group, RENEW."

"Sometimes they just introduce me. A lot of it is one-on-one with women's organizations. They want to know what I stand for," said the pro-life candidate.

In case you watched TV and still missed them, here are excerpts. Romney, at 1:57 p.m.: "Growing up in a working-class neighbor-

"The fundamental values that have made our nation great: personal responsibility, the work ethic, strong families, love of God. These are American values ...

"As a woman blessed with five wonderful children, and driven by the responsibility to ensure that their generation has a chance at the American dream, I say let the debate begin."

Heintz at 11:55 a.m.: "I bring you greetings from the tax-cutting state of Michigan."

"Just last week I won my primary election and the high privilege of representing the Republican party in our campaign to unseat liberal Democrat whip David Bonior in November ...

"I was also thrilled when Bob Dole threw down the gauntlet before Bill Clinton with a plan for tax cuts. This is going to be great for me ... In my primary, I ran on the platform that the top three problems facing families in Michigan's 10th Congressional District are taxes, taxes and taxes."

"(With) the backing of Gov. John Engler, America's tax-cutting champion, I was chosen to take on

America's tax-raising champion, David Bonior ..."

Heintz's successor in the governor's Detroit office, Anne Mervenne, played a "floating" game at the convention.

"Yesterday, the Republican Governors' Association needed help with their office, and I went there. The governor has an office here, and I'm answering the phone," said the Birmingham native who once worked for Sen. Doug Cruse and spent four years as Engler's appointments manager.

Mervenne is a backup for JT — the insiders' term for press secretary John Truscott.

JT had to handle the logistics of getting Engler in the right spot at the right time for appearances on CNN, "Larry King Live" and David Brinkley's mid-Sunday show. Engler also was scheduled to address the convention twice.

Unlike Romney and Heintz, Mervenne has shown no propensity to run for a more visible office.

"I can't imagine not being in politics or government," she said.

Student success coalition bears down on objectives

Members of the Coalition for Student Success did more than play sand volleyball during their summer vacation.

The Northville Public School District's newest coalition, charged with drafting a plan for the educational future of Northville High School, has moved into high gear to accomplish the initiatives it was charged with by the Northville Board of Education in May.

The group began tackling several initiatives that, when implemented, will change the way students are educated at the high school, according to Coalition

Chairman and Northville High School Principal Tom Johnson.

"We've had a very short but eventful history, and we're excited about what we've accomplished so far," he said. "I'm particularly pleased about the amount of work that has been accomplished in a very short period of time. This group of people has come together, from a student oriented perspective, to meet the challenges that will carry this high school into the 21st century."

The Coalition has set its timeline to complete the eight initiatives it was originally charged with when the school board approved the organization's formation in April.

According to Johnson, the first initiative - implementing mechanisms for effective communication and collaboration with parents, teachers and the community - was accomplished in May.

The group worked through the summer and completed the high school's vision statement that will serve as a yardstick to measure how well the school is doing in providing a positive learning environment.

The vision statement is a combination of the school's mission statement and the graduate profile/adult role models developed in 1989, according to Johnson.

"The mission statement simply

says that the staff of the high school, in partnership with students, parents, and the community, are committed to mutual responsibility for learning through effective teaching," Johnson said. "Our mission is to challenge all students to reach their potential and to develop responsible citizens in a caring and supportive environment."

The coalition consists of 14 members: Tina Juntunen, Josh Brugeman, and Kevin Wood are student representatives; Al Ferrara, Judy Prain, and Dale Otterman serve as parent and community representatives; and Sue Couzens, Jan Smith, Maureen

Gorshak, Ron Meteyer, Chris Ford, Ann Cook, and Carolyn Bovair serve as teacher/counselor representatives.

Of the eight initiatives four have completion dates in September and October.

The others are slated to be completed by late January or early February 1997.

Johnson said the coalition will study several possible changes and conduct a review of the high school's organizational practices and support services.

It will also study high school scheduling options, identify a learning environment and school climate that will support high academic and social expectations for students, review athletic programs and other activities, determine a relevant curriculum and effective instructional program practice, and compare the high school's graduate profile and adult roles to curriculum and program systems.

"We're looking for volunteers to serve on several task forces to study those issues," Johnson said. "We have an ambitious schedule for accomplishing our objectives and we appreciate the support of the community."

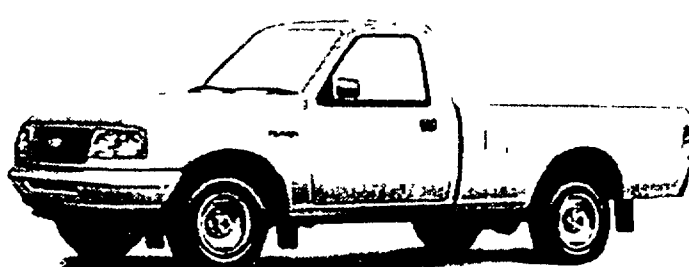

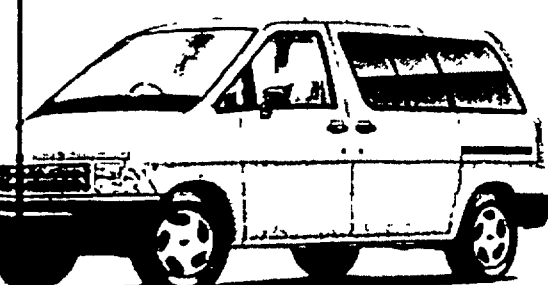

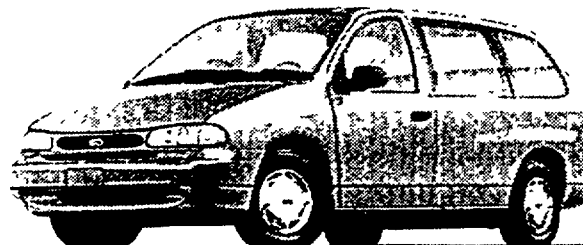

Township eyes changes in special zoning law

The Northville Township Board of Trustees wants to sharpen the primary tool it hopes to use to influence design plans for the Wayne County land on the south side of town.

The land, all 942 acres worth, is zoned for residential use, almost all of it R-2 and R-3 zoning, meaning single family homes. Wayne County, however, is hoping to do something different with its huge parcel through the use of the township's planned unit development (PUD) ordinance.

The PUD is a tradeoff of sorts, a zoning option that takes the form of a legal contract. The township agrees to let a developer (in this case, the county) craft design plans that call for uses which normal zoning doesn't allow.

In return the developer's plan must provide a "recognizable and substantial benefit," which a conventional design would not. The judge of whether or not a proposal meets that standard is the board, which can choose to grant or deny a PUD plan based on the level of perceived benefit.

For several months now township officials have looked at updat-

ing, tightening and more clearly defining several sections of the complex PUD ordinance. That action would coincide with the county's moves to bring forward a concrete PUD proposal.

It's no coincidence, actually, since township officials are none too subtle about the fact that those moves are the main thing driving the ordinance changes.

By law the township planning commission must review the board's latest modifications to the PUD law. Once commissioners have had their say the altered ordinance will go back to the board for final approval, disap-

proval or yet more changes.

Among the key adjustments under discussion at the board's Aug. 8 meeting:

- Cutting back on the amount of land to be developed for commercial business use.

The current PUD ordinance allows up to 3 percent of a site to be used as commercial, which in the county parcel's case means about 28 acres.

Several board members said they're afraid that would mean another Meijer-sized development which could threaten the health of Northville city's downtown business district.

Four of the seven trustees, in fact, called for a ban on any commercial land to prevent that possibility. They also cited the fact that the acres set aside in the county plan for commercial use are at Five Mile and Sheldon, right across the street from existing and under-construction commercial development in Plymouth Township.

Trustee Mark Abbo, however, convinced them that a total prohibition wasn't the smart course. He maintained that the thousands of people who will live on the county land in years to come will need and want neighborhood shopping.

"If we have to have it let's put it on the fringes of the community, separated from residential areas by proper buffering," Abbo said.

In the end the board lowered the maximum commercial space rule to 1.8 percent, which will accommodate the county's proposal for 17 acres worth at Five and Sheldon. The change includes:

- A new requirement requiring developers to provide land and other resources for public services and facilities in order to meet the demand created by new residents for police and fire protection and so on.

- Calling for a minimum of five

percent of the total site area to be set aside as dedicated public recreation space.

- Revising the definition of "open space." The board can allow a developer to build smaller - and therefore more - home lots than what normal zoning allows in return for the setting aside of land for recreational use by a site's future residents.

Trustees want to tighten up the open space rules, particularly what qualifies and what doesn't. A key question in that debate will be whether or not a golf course, which the county has discussed, will qualify as open space.

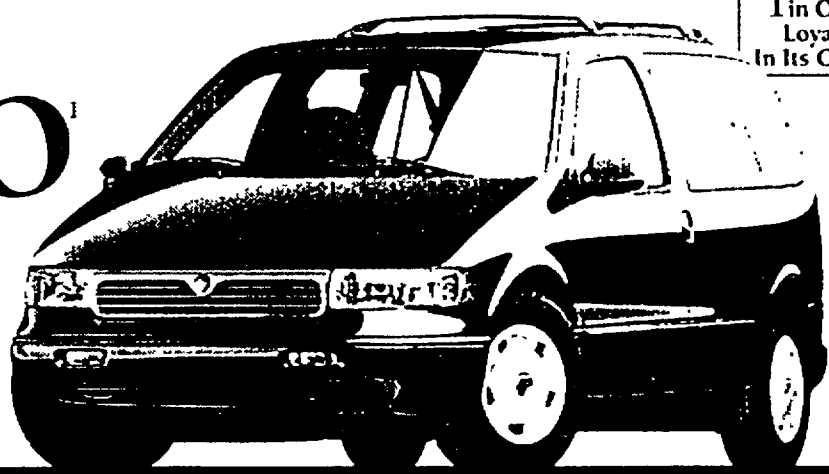

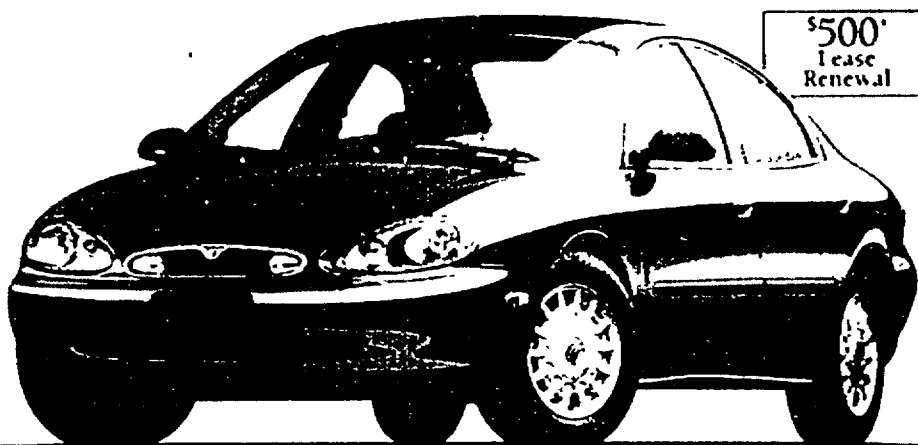

HEALTH NOTE

STRENGTH TRAINING ANYONE?

Tennis players can increase their competitive advantage and lower their risk for injury from overuse by engaging in strength training. Because tennis emphasizes the use of certain muscles and neglects others, it fosters muscle imbalances that can lead to such problems as tendonitis. Strength training helps prevent these problems by compensating for these muscle imbalances. For instance, "tennis elbow" (epicondylitis) eventually forces about half of all tennis players who play at least three times weekly out of action. The problem occurs when elbow tendons develop microscopic tears due to twisting of the arm (as when the ball hits the racket off center). Players who strengthen their arms with exercise can better resist these forces and avert injury. Experts underscore the importance of receiving careful instruction in strength training equipment and exercises to maximize benefits and reduce the risk of injury. Because strength training can trigger increases in blood pressure, it is also important to review any exercise plan, strength training or aerobic, with your doctor. Edenderry issue ends up in court

lining streets like Pinebrook, Shadbrook and Edenderry drives. The people living there have aimed intense resistance at proposals calling for the streets in the Woods subdivision to connect to theirs. Right now all three drives are dead-ends and residents say they like it that way: connections, they've maintained, would bring more traffic, crime and problems. It was in this battle that township supervisor candidate Bob

Grant, defeated in last week's Republican primary, first made his mark in local politics. Grant, an attorney, led the fight against any connectors and has been a driving force behind the township board's firm stance on the issue ever since. The problem is that while the township board won't approve any plan that includes road connections, Wayne County won't allow any proposal that excludes them. Citing the need for police, fire and ambulance vehicles to have the

fastest possible access in the event of emergencies, county road officials demand that at least two of three drives be connected through to Woods. The current stalemate has been around since autumn 1994, despite repeated round-robin talks involving Cambridge, area residents, the board and Wayne County. Cambridge attorney Joe Galvin has told trustees that the Guidobono brothers don't care which plan is approved so long as one is given the green light. Meanwhile a good portion of the multi-million-dollar Woods sub has remained unbuilt. Then, on Aug. 6, the lawsuit was filed. Grant and Galvin could not be reached for comment. Township officials declined to comment, citing the pending suit. In his brief filed with the circuit court Galvin said that "Northville Township and Wayne County have imposed mutually inconsistent requirements upon Cambridge" and that "either Northville Township has a clear legal duty to

approve the two-connection plan or Wayne County has a clear legal duty to approve the no-connection plan." The company, Galvin contends, "has suffered and will continue to suffer immediate and irreparable harm" if nothing is done. He is asking Judge Brian Zahra to either order the township to approve the two-connection plan or order Wayne County to approve the no-connection option. Northville Township must file a formal response to the suit with the court by Aug. 27.

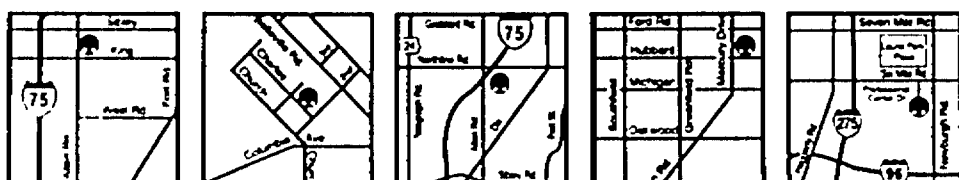

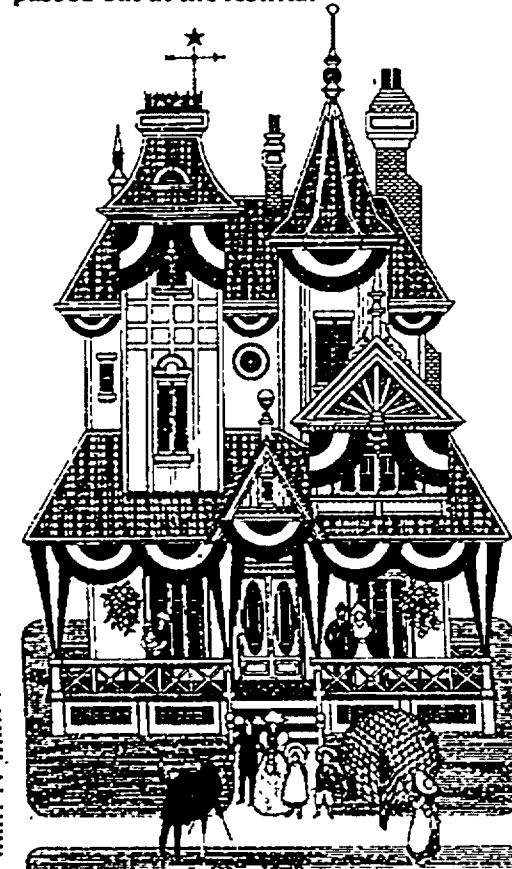

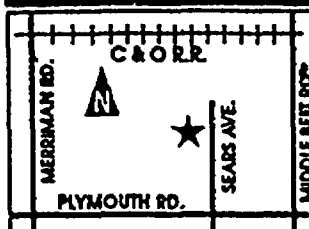

Last week this column featured a short introduction to Mill Race Village for newcomers to the area. This week more about the buildings.

Hunter House, a Greek Revival home, was built originally in 1848 or '49 for

Stephen and Mary Hunter. It stood at the foot of Griswold where today Griswold crosses past Main Street heading to Northville Downs. Until the mid 1970s the road ended at Main.

Hunter came to Northville with a nephew from Aberdeen, Scotland, in 1848. Within months of his arrival he married Mary Cady, a local woman.

They had two children and were residing in the home on Main Street by the time of the 1850 census.

Hunter died in 1853, but his wife continued to live with her children in the home until her death 25 years later.

Yerkes House, a Gothic revival style, was built just after the conclusion of the Civil War for William Purdy Yerkes, the son of William and Hester Dennis Yerkes and Sallie Cady Yerkes, the daughter of Daniel and Eliza Ellsworth Cady.

William and Sallie, sometimes identified as Sarah, had no children. William served as first village president for Northville when the town declared its separation from Plymouth in 1867. He also served in Detroit and Lansing as a judge and a lawyer.

Both were the children of the community's earliest settlers. William arrived with his parents as a young child in 1826. Sal-

lie was born 20 years after her father arrived in the area. He returned to New York in 1828 to marry her mother having lost his first wife to death.

The home was located originally on the south side of East Cady just to the west of First Presbyterian Church. The site today is a parking lot for the city. The house was moved to Mill Race in 1973.

Next week will conclude this series on highlights about Mill Race buildings.

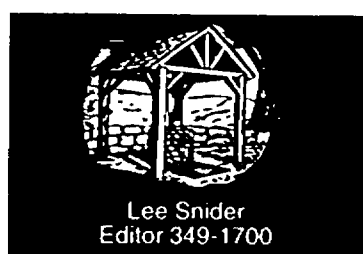

Community programs get credit for decline

It's gratifying to know that the incidents of drunk driving are on the way down in Northville. According to figures released by the city police department, drunk driving arrests plunged by 46 percent through the first three months of this year, compared to the same period of 1995.

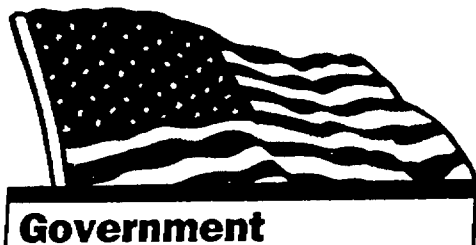
Since, during the January-to-March period, patrol efforts remained roughly equal to year-ago levels, the drop off in arrests can only mean that fewer drivers are choosing to drive while impaired.

That's definitely a positive development, especially in light of statistics showing that drunk driving arrests increased in 1995, reversing a statewide trend that had held steady for several years.

Police Chief Rodney Cannon attributes the lower OUIL rate to two things: a less tolerant attitude among the authorities and the implementation of a new law enforcement program, Safe and Sober.

There is every reason to believe Cannon is right in his assessment. It's a simple truth that laws that are strictly enforced are less likely to be broken a second and third time. Conversely, lax enforcement of local strictures is a prescription for disaster and an open invitation for violators to repeat their offenses.

It appears the communitywide zero tolerance campaign that has been in place for over two years now is beginning to impact attitudes and help change long-standing beliefs. The cam-



paign is based on the simple premise that it isn't enough just to speak in serious terms. People who offer verbal disapproval but are quick to forgive and forget are true enablers, failing to create a climate of urgency. Their lack of commitment amounts to an unspoken condonation of violators' behavior.

Whether or not the police department's Safe and Sober campaign - which is part of a wider regional program - was influenced by the efforts of the Zero Tolerance Committee, there is little doubt that zero tolerance is an idea whose time has come. The city ordinance seeking payment of service fees from drunk drivers is another example of intolerant treatment, and probably should also be credited with helping to reduce OUIL occurrences.

We would like to offer encouragement to the Zero Tolerance Committee, composed of concerned volunteers from the community, to continue their efforts. And we want to commend the city police department, and Officer Bill Edgar in particular, for their apparently effective attempts to reduce the incidents of drunk driving. As a result of their energies, the community is a little safer place.

Should they prosecute?

Just as it takes an entire village to raise a child, a whole village must cast its eyes in mourning at the passing of one of its own.

This community was deeply moved by the tragic death of Chris Mudge, the 16-year-old Northville youth who was killed in an auto accident July 24 in Salem Township. Chris was a well-known youth with many friends and interests. His popularity was attested to by the turnout of 250 people at his funeral service.

Chris' parents, Robert and Pat Mudge, were interviewed by a reporter of this newspaper last week. Like all loving parents, the Mudges were proud of their son, and looked forward with hope and anticipation to his promising future. Now they must confront a crushing loss, and their courage can serve as a comfort to everyone who has struggled with disappointment, large and small.

In keeping with their spirit of forgiveness, Robert and Pat Mudge are unhappy with the possibility that criminal charges might be brought against

the 16-year-old youth, a good friend of Chris, who was driving the car that fateful night. Police investigators have recommended that the Washtenaw County prosecutor pursue misdemeanor charges against the driver. No decision has been made to date.

While we understand the Mudies desire to bring closure to this case and admire their generosity in wanting to spare the driver of the car further pain, we know too that the implications of the prosecutor's action will go beyond this one instance. As with every traffic-related accident, there is precedent to consider. Public policy as a whole will be affected by the outcome of the investigation, and the wider range of public safety interests must be taken into account before any decision can be made.

We wish the Mudies well as they begin to rebuild their lives and carry on. And we pray that prosecutors will be guided by the hand of good wisdom as they make difficult decisions about the legal questions that are an inevitable part of the equation.

Bond hype on the way

Northville residents, prepare yourselves for the onslaught of information.

With six weeks to go before voters go to the polls to decide the fate of the Northville Public School District's \$61 million bond question, a new citizens bond committee is going to provide residents with enough information to make their heads swim.

One word of caution. Too much information can be a dangerous thing.

There will be phone calls, leaflets, pamphlets, meetings, coffees, more phone calls, questionnaires, and newsletters jam packed with everything you need to know about the bonds and what they'll be used for.

Correct that. You'll receive everything bond proponents want you to know about the bonds and what they'll be used for.

That's why I urge caution. Because what this committee, and others like it, will be orchestrating is one-sided - information will be disseminated and nothing more. There will be no time for formal discussions, no time for tough questions. There will only be information - their information.

Now I'm not about to tell you how to vote on Sept. 23. What I am suggesting, however, is that residents should not base their decisions solely on the information provided by bond proponents. We should not be swept up in rhetoric that suggests "this is our last chance for a new high school," or "we should approve

this bond because the citizens committee worked so hard on the recommendation."

No, it's not our last chance to build a new high school. It may be our last chance to build a high school for \$40 million - construction costs do go up - but there are plenty of other avenues that may not have been explored.

And yes, plenty of residents did work hard on the bond, technology and enhancement committees, but that doesn't mean a community must turn over \$61 million to pay for that hard work.

What taxpayers need to consider is the bottom line. Does the school district need to build a new high school? Will student projections warrant a new building? What type of new technology will this money bring our students? What about training for teachers and administrators? Have district officials been good financial stewards with our tax dollars? How much will this increase our tax burden? Are their alternatives that have not been explored to accomplish the same goal?

That brings us to the most important question of all - will approval of this \$61 million bond issue improve the quality of education provided to our children, and would that quality deteriorate drastically without the new building and the new technology?

In the final analysis all of the reports, charts, graphs, studies, and meetings become moot points.

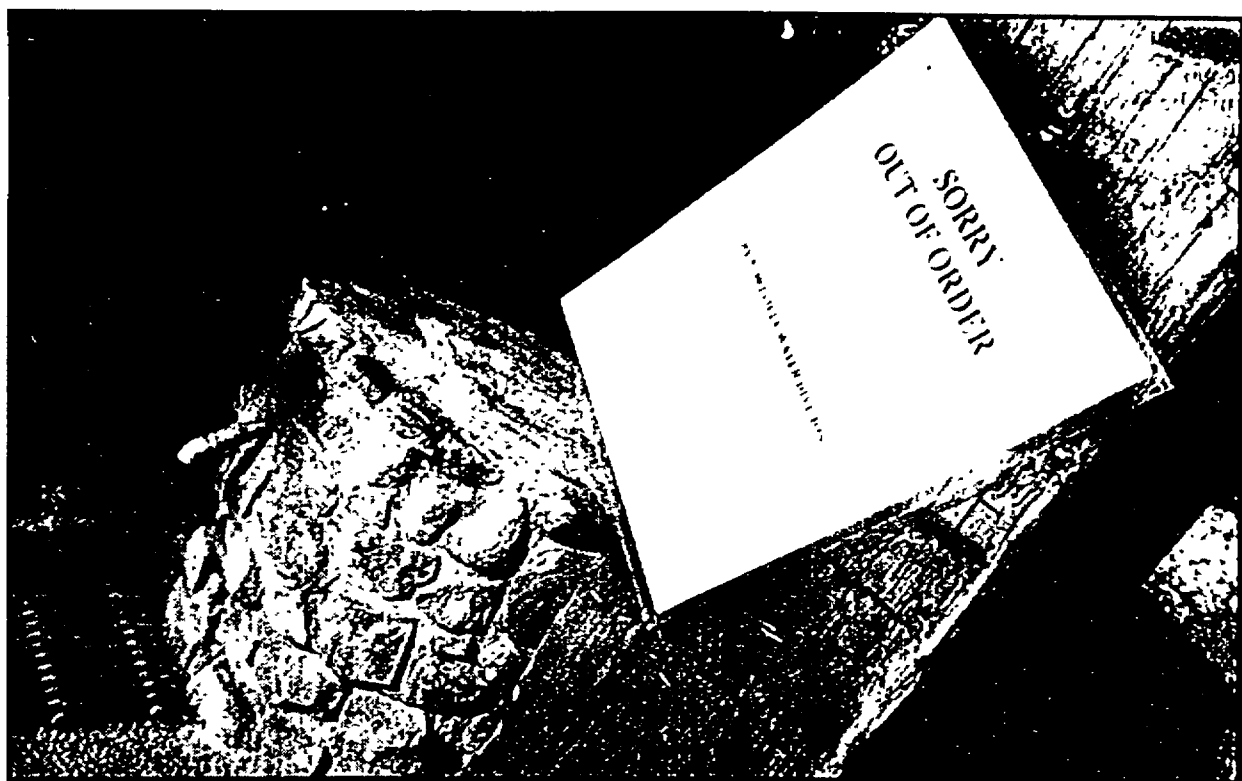
This issue should not just be about bricks and mortar or new classrooms and crowded hallways, it should be about our kids and preparing them for their future in society.

That's something you can't really put a price tag on.

How does board justify increases?

It wasn't long ago that the Northville Board of Education gave Superintendent Rezmierski a satisfaction rating of just over 80 percent.

That means that in any given week, the board is not satisfied with his performance for one full day. In the real world, if you fail to produce one day per week, you're looking for a new job. In the Northville Public Schools, you're looking at a pay raise.

So, what exactly did the Northville Board of Education base its administrators pay increases on?

We were told that "these people put in 70 or 80 hours each week." That means that they are working from 8 a.m. to midnight, Monday through Friday. I know school board meetings are long, but 80 hours per week? I don't think so.

We were told that the district's high MEAP scores were another reason. However, the superintendent himself says that the MEAP scores should not be relied upon

as an achievement indicator.

We were told that if you look at the size of the district, the number of employees, the amount of revenues, and the responsibilities of the superintendent, it is right in line with "the standards of industry."

If the "industry" referred to is public education, the graphic in last week's *Northville Record* shows that our superintendent is grossly overcompensated. If the "industry" referred to is the free market, the comparison is invalid. In the real world of the free market, you must remain competitive to remain in business. Remember, the Northville Public Schools decided to avoid competition by opting out of the Schools of Choice program.

We were told that turnover in the superintendent's position is high with top quality people leaving districts across the county. Where could they possibly go without taking a substantial reduction in compensation and a corresponding increase in student population and district size?

We were told to consider other factors such as his doctorate degree (a minimal requirement of the superintendent). Chances are, we never will. When I last asked to see the job descriptions of the administrators, I was told that no such documents exist.

So what exactly did the Northville Board of Education base its administrators pay increases on?

Livonia approves theater complex

Orchestrated argument gave way to spontaneous emotion late Monday when the Livonia City Council unanimously approved a plan for a 20-screen movie theater.

The 7-0 vote, after more than three hours of charged public comment in a packed city hall auditorium, was greeted with applause from a largely pro-theater crowd and hugs and words of congratulations for those with a stake in the project.

"We're delighted," said developer Gary Jonna of The Jonna Companies, spokesman for the planned \$30 million Pentagon Centre

Entertainment Campus. "They made a decision based on fact, not fiction, and that was important to us."

The move awaits a probable veto by Mayor Jack Kirksey, who is calling for a compromise proposal with fewer screens. Just as probable is the council's rejection of the veto.

Theater opponents, however, vowed they'll lobby to sustain it.

"We still don't have an overall philosophy of what we want" in terms of development said William Fried of Citizens Against Constructing a 20-Theater Complex in

Livonia. "That's my main complaint."

Monday's vote approved a zoning waiver and a site plan for an AMC Entertainment theater on Haggerty north of Seven Mile. Waivers for two Pentagon Centre restaurants - J. Alexander's and Champps Americana - were also approved.

The theater, designed as the Pentagon center's anchor, will have more than 4,000 seats in auditoriums ranging from 129 to nearly 500 seats. AMC has promised state-of-the-art projection and sound equipment, plush

seating on 18-inch risers, a spacious lobby, convenient concession stands and a wide range of movies - and movie starting times - to choose from.

The 35.4 acre Pentagon Centre will also feature the restaurants, both part of national chains, about 1,700 parking spaces, tree-lined, lighted sidewalks and a centerpiece fountain.

Future possibilities include a third restaurant, a bookstore, a hotel and a fitness club. The inter-

est is there, Jonna said, and the site could accommodate two or three of those options in addition to what has already been announced.

"We've tried to design this project with people in mind ... this project is unique. There is nothing like it in the city of Livonia," Jonna said as discussion on the proposal began.

Pro-theater speakers, including building tradesmen from area unions and employees of AMC's theaters at Laurel Park Place, said the complex would provide job opportunities and an attractive, safe environment for dining and

movie going.

Detractors said they fear the theater will draw too much traffic for local roads, become a magnet for crimes such as larceny and auto theft, lead to water runoff into lower-lying areas of the city and hurt the viability of Livonia's other movie theaters.

"I really don't think Livonia needs 20 new theaters," said Bob Duda. "They're not doing us any favors."

Members of the WindRidge subdivision in Northville Township also expressed misgivings about the plan.

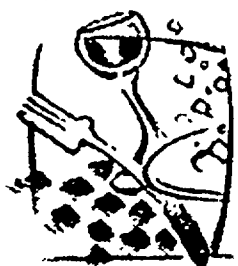

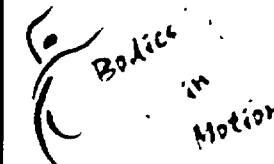

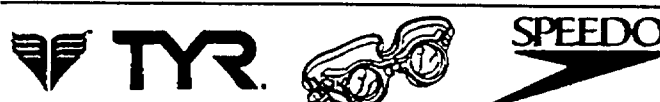

Court paves way for road suits

Road officials can be sued if they fail to post warning signs or signals at hazardous spots such as intersections, the Michigan Supreme Court has ruled.

The highest state court decided 4-3 against the Gratiot County Road Commission in a 1988 suit resulting from a collision at Roosevelt and Crapo, two gravel roads

where visibility was blocked by an orchard. The justices ruled there was a "duty to warn."

"We were very pleased when Pick (victory) came down," said Wayne J. Miller, the attorney who filed a brief on behalf of the Brain Injury Association of Michigan. "We have had one case on hold for two years pending the result of Pick."

Miller said recent appellate court decisions have swung "so far to

the right" in favor of road agencies that it was "gratifying the Supreme Court drew the line on this insanity." He blamed "the Engler administration and the Republican hierarchy" for reducing injured people's chances to collect and taking the pressure off safety efforts.

Miller rated the Oakland County Road Commission "outstanding" in its safety efforts but found "lots of cases" in Jackson County.

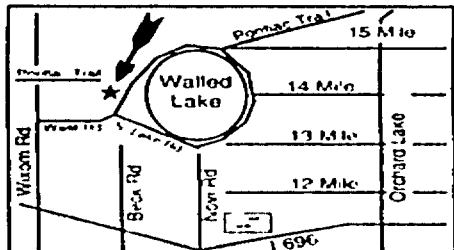

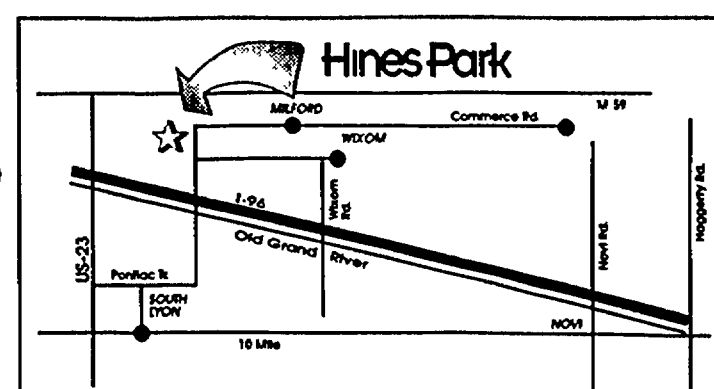

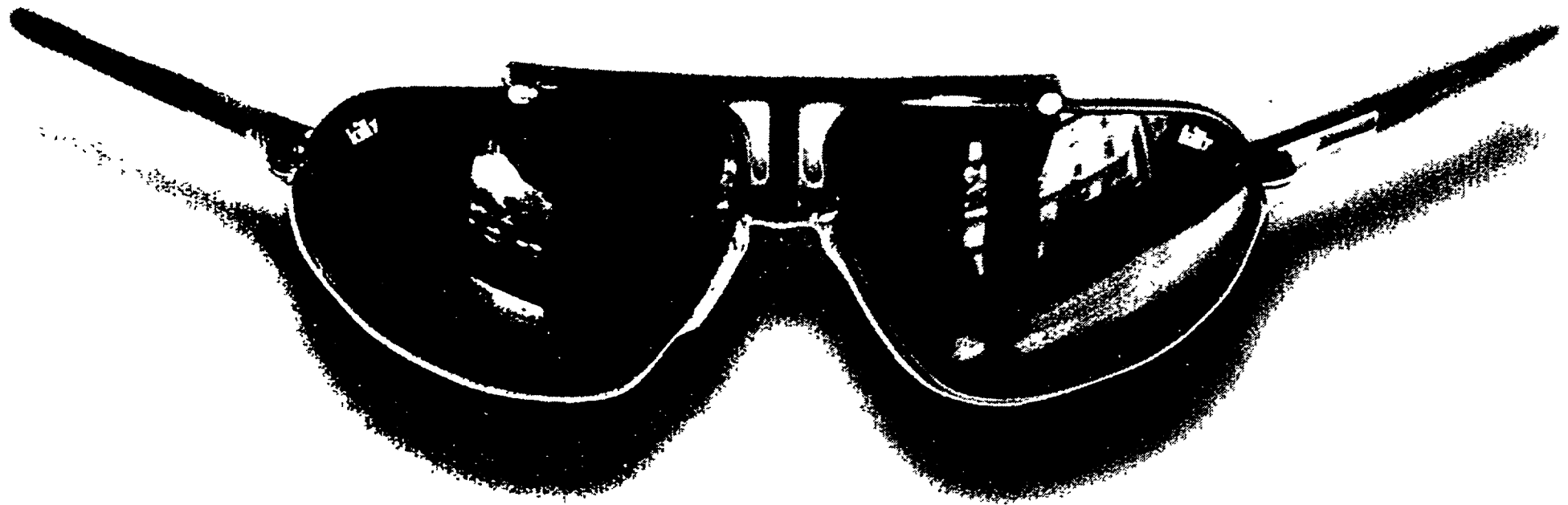

unglasses ... they rest on your nose and hook behind the ears and are a must for keeping out damaging UV rays during passive activities like sunbathing.

People who are more active, however, have specific needs when it comes to sunglasses.

When deciding on a pair of active wear sunglasses, first look at the lens.

"Athletes demand perfect optical clarity," said Jerrod Monte, salesperson with Sunglass Hut International at Twelve Oaks Mall. When they go to hit the ball, they don't want to be a little off, they want to be right on.

Avoid hot poured lenses which are cooled in a mold. There are little imperfections in the lenses you can't see but the eye muscle can pick up, according to Monte.

"If you have two pair of sunglasses, you can perceptually tell," said Gary Reggish, the owner of Urban Optiks in Northville. "When you look through a pair of good sunglasses you should have clear vision."

Lenses in active wear are made of a plastic called polycarbonate which produces a very strong, durable lens. Lenses should have the same ultraviolet A and B protection as is in regular sunglasses, but less expensive lenses will have a spray-on coating to protect against ultraviolet A and B rays. A coating that is sprayed on will wipe off whenever the lenses are cleaned, according to Monte.

A regular tinted lens filters out brightness and uses an ultraviolet filter, according to Reggish. A polarized lens takes it one step further. In addition to the filtering capability, a polarized lens is going to dramatically reduce direct glare. Direct glare occurs when the sun reflects off the water, a windshield or the bumper of a car.

"This lens is the Cadillac of sunglasses," Reggish said.

The weight of the frame is another consideration. Sports eyewear needs to be lighter than regular glasses. Frames are available in plastic and a lightweight metal. The hinge on plastic frames may be molded right into the frame in a standard male-female hinge configuration. With the elimination of the metal screws and hinges, the frames will be lighter. Metal frames should have a spring hinge.

Active people break a sweat once in a while so it's important that the metal frame be corrosion resistant. Choose a frame with a protective coating to protect it from corrosion.

The type of sport may figure into the style of the frame. Wrap around frames are good for bikers because they protect the eyes from wind.

Sports can get physical at times so safety should figure into the overall decision. Active wear glasses have a silicone or soft rubber nose pad which is softer on impact than the nose pad on everyday wear glasses. A shock absorbent nose pad allows the frame to move with the individual.

"Much like the shock absorbers in your car they take that shock easier," Reggish said. "It moves with you as opposed to bouncing against you."

On some active wear glasses, the temple tips can be turned down, giving more grip behind the ear so the frames don't slip down and fall off. Temple tips can be returned to the original position for everyday wear.

Prices for active wear sunglasses are within the range of most customers. Expect to pay from \$50 to \$150 for active wear top brands like Oakley, Gargoyles, Bolle and Anarchy, which are available at Sunglass Hut.

Killy models range from \$215 to \$490. They are considered technical eyewear because they can be used for both active and passive activities and are available in both non-prescription and prescription lenses.

Urban Optiks in Northville is the exclusive local carrier of Killy.

Eyewear that is designed for both active and passive activities eliminates the need for two different pairs of glasses.

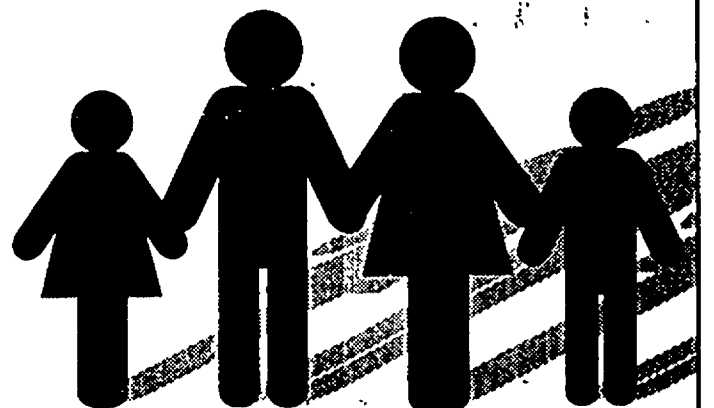

Orto has been shooting photos at the Michigan Renaissance Festival for the past five years, but this is the first year she has won the contest. She usually shoots five to seven rolls of film per year, some for her own personal use.

"I started shooting in color mainly when I started photographing," she said. "It attracts my eye a lot more than black and white although black and white has its advantages in some respects."

This year it was hard to narrow it down, mainly because she didn't shoot as many rolls of film as in past years.

Although Orto has been taking photographs for 15 years, it wasn't until eight years ago that she started freelancing.

Orto mainly photographs celebri-

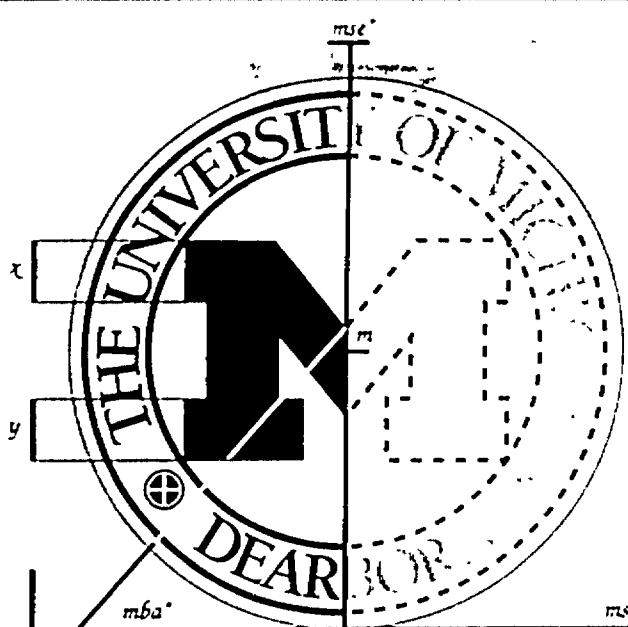

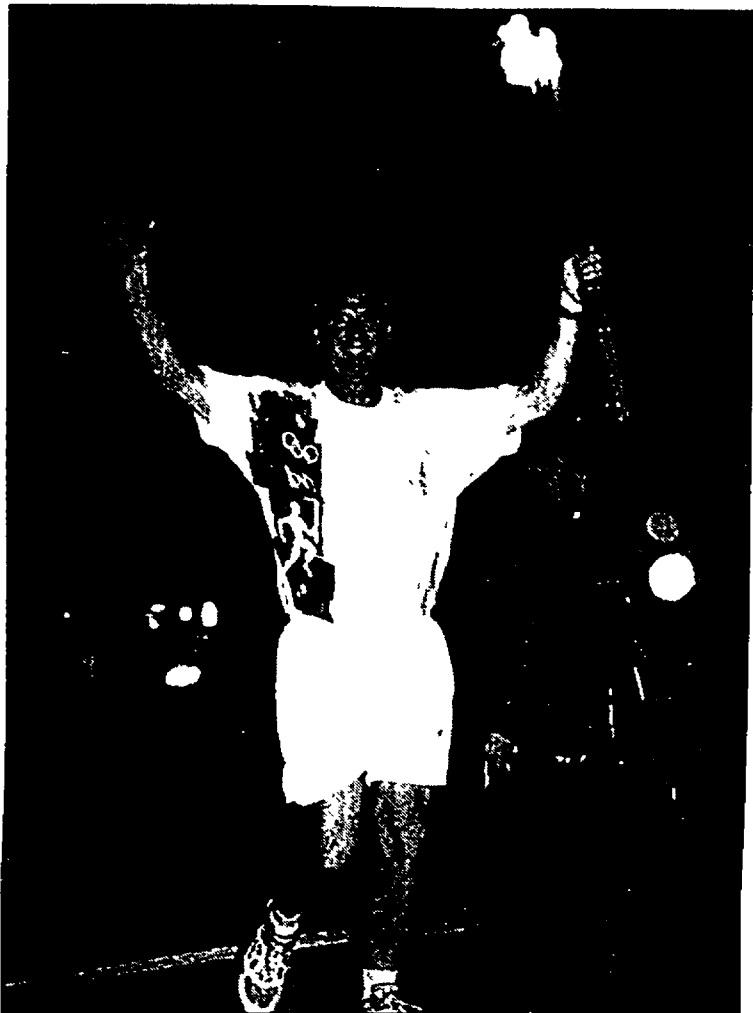

'TRAINSPOTTING'

Wildly popular British film now showing in the U.S.

"Choose life. Choose a job. Choose a career. Choose a family. Choose a big television, choose washing machines, cars, compact disc players and electric can openers...Choose good health, low cholesterol, and dental insurance...Choose sitting on that couch watching mind-numbing spirit-crushing game shows, stuffing junk food into your mouth.

Choose rotting away at the end of it all, living in a miserable home, nothing more than an embarrassment to the selfish, messed up brats you spawned to replace yourself. Choose your future. Choose life.

But why would I want to do a thing like that?"

So asks Mark Renton (Ewan McGregor), the drug-addicted anti-hero of Miramax's "Trainspotting." "I chose not to choose life," Renton confides. "I chose something else. And the reasons?

There are no reasons. Who needs reasons when you've got heroin?"

Described by critics as the best and most important film about modern-day Britain in nearly a decade, "Trainspotting" has already become the second-highest grossing British film of all time in the U.K., after "Four Weddings and a Funeral."

The movie that inspired a 10-minute standing ovation at the 1996 Cannes Film Festival, "Trainspotting" is set in the seamy, unsavory, underworld of Edinburgh's thriving drug culture.

Pulsating and exhilarating at its lean 94 minutes, "Trainspotting" offers what Newsweek magazine calls "a masterful waltz on the wild side."

Adapted from the harrowing and hilarious novel by Irvine Welsh, "Trainspotting" charts the disintegrating friendship of a group of

heroin addicts and the various junkies, psychopaths, liars and thieves who move in and out of their lives as they proceed inevitably toward their self-destruction — or perhaps their willingness to ultimately "choose life."

Director Danny Boyle, producer Andrew Macdonald and writer John Hodge (the team responsible for last year's critically acclaimed "Shallow Grave"), have created in "Trainspotting" a buoyant, raucous and very funny look at issues of friendship, loyalty and betrayal in the lives of disenfranchised youth.

"I was really bowled over by Welsh's novel," says Andrew Macdonald. "It's so powerful and uncompromising and, I believe, truthful and insightful about a certain section of British society. These are people who don't usually get represented in fiction."

Screenwriter John Hodge, a

practicing physician, says the script he wrote is a straightforward account of a particular culture, the dangers of which are well known.

He believes the film neither glamorizes nor dismisses people who use heroin. "It's an honest portrayal of the highs and consequences."

The term "Trainspotting" refers to a British hobby, popular among young males, in which people watch trains for hours or even days. They collect information about railway timetables and rail gradients, meticulously recording information they will likely never have any use for. It often becomes an obsession, taking over the lives of the trainspotters.

The film's title serves as an apt metaphor for Renton and his mates. They are obsessed with drugs — which the novel's author refers to as "another futile hobby."

Slow story, muffled voices ruin 'Lone Star'

Wait for the dollar show. Thirty years ago a crime was committed when a man disappeared. It was assumed that he had taken a great deal of money and left the town that he had controlled as the mean, heartless sheriff. But quite unexpectedly evidence is discovered that may indicate that the sheriff had been murdered when the remains of his body are found in the desert outside town.

Kris Kristofferson does an excellent performance as the cruel and twisted sheriff that stopped at nothing to manipulate the town for his own personal gain. It is not surprising that he may have been murdered. The question becomes, "who did it?"

The new sheriff suspects that his father may have been the one to pull the trigger. After all, his father was the sheriff that followed Kristofferson and openly opposed his unethical standards of law enforcement. As the mystery unfolds it becomes apparent who may be the suspect.

The story is interesting but the downfall of the movie is that it moves along very slowly. In addition to length of the film there is a problem with the articulation of the voices. 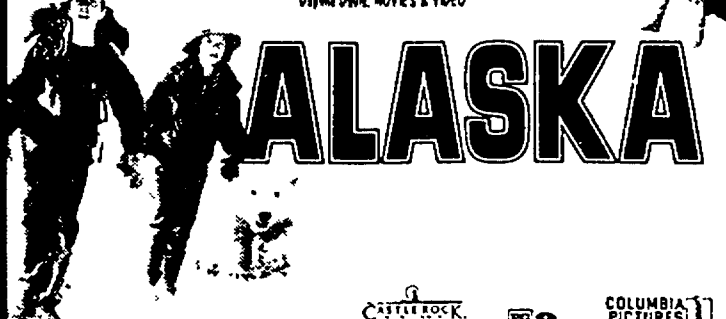

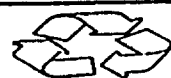

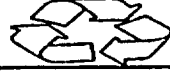

Original control freak

Handling, not speed, compels racer to strive for winner's circle

At one point or another almost all of us have known a daredevil in our lives.

Perhaps it was the kid down the block who had no fear of climbing even the tallest neighborhood trees. It could be a friend who insists on jumping out of a perfectly good airplane or a co-worker who bunji jumps on weekends.

One would figure that these are the kind of folks who might enjoy competitive auto racing. It is, after all, living life on the thinnest of edges.

For Cary Cole, nothing could be further from the truth. While the 28-year-old acknowledges his hobby has a real element of danger, that isn't why he races.

"I'm definitely not there for the thrill," the Northville resident said. "The speed is one of the hardest things to get used to. If we raced at

80 miles an hour I'd be just as happy.

"I'm there to race and compete. I get a thrill out of controlling the car."

Cole is one of a handful of aspiring drivers competing in the prestigious Skip Barber Formula Dodge series this summer. The Ford engineer already has a pair of top five finishes to his credit.

"It's a very good test of my driving ability," Cole said of the Barber series. "I'm going up against the best."

Even though he's a rookie when it comes to racing open-wheel, full-sized cars, speeding around a track has been a life-long passion.

Cole grew up in the small rural town of Jacksonville, Ill. While other youngsters were rooting for the Cubs or Bears, he was keeping up on the latest exploits of Richard Petty and Al Unser.

"I always had an interest in

cars," said Cole. "I always loved racing."

By the time he was in high school, the Illinois native turned that fancy into reality.

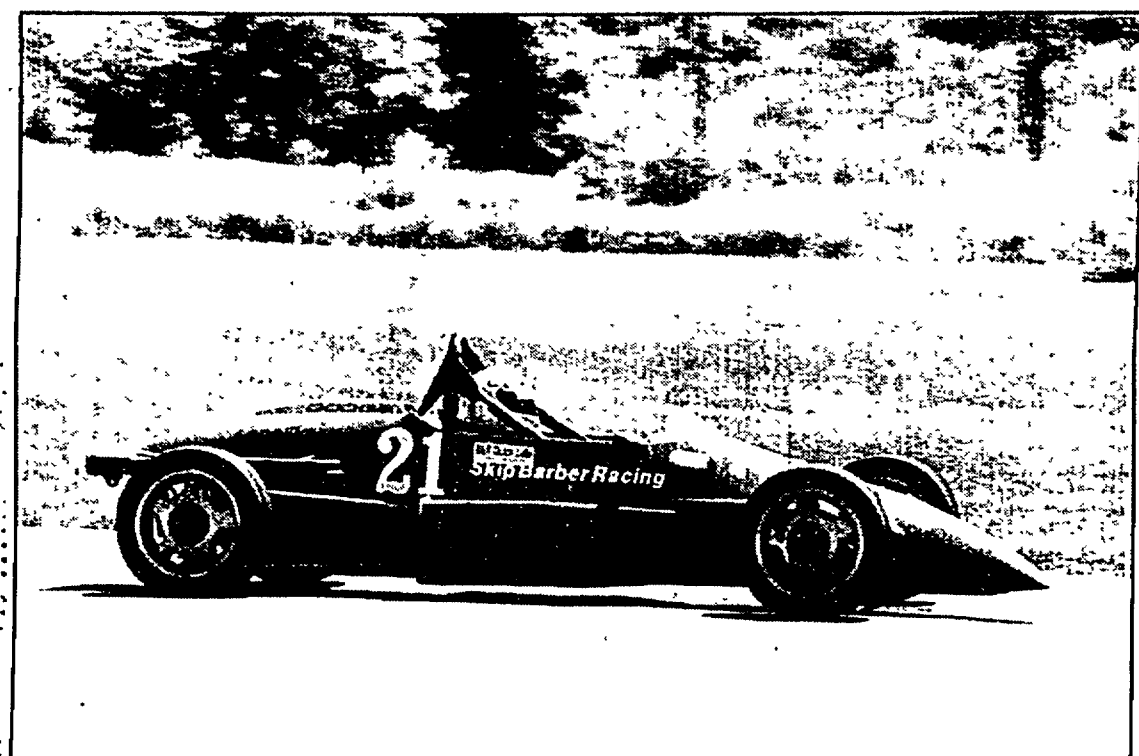
From 1984-88, Cole won numerous track championships racing three- and four-wheel all terrain vehicles. Despite that success, he wouldn't race cars.

Cole was comfortable with dirt tracks and the feel of his ATVs. But a car? That was a different story.

"I didn't know how a car would react to pavement," he said, citing costs and other reasons for avoiding auto racing as well. "It was my lack of confidence."

Racing went completely on the back burner for Cary during his college days at the University of Illinois. While the sport was still in the back of his mind, Cole concen-

Rule changes tougher on coaches, players

The sounds of basketballs, soccer balls and tennis balls bouncing, golf balls being hit off the tee, herds of cross country runners taking off, swimmers and divers making waves, and the pop of football pads making contact are not far off with the start of the 1996-97 school year. Another exciting fall sports schedule is anticipated, with eight sports sponsored by the Michigan High School Athletic Association.

Practices for all fall sports are already under way. Competitions begin in a few weeks.

The new school year brings with it some

changes in sportsmanship initiatives, tournament formats and competition rules. The MHSAA Representative Council passed several measures at its May meeting to emphasize the role of sportsmanship in educational athletics, and to penalize those who imitate the behavior often seen at professional and collegiate sporting events.

The new rules would prohibit any coach who has been disqualified for unsportsmanlike conduct two or more times in a season, and any player who has been disqualified for unsportsmanlike conduct

three or more times in a season, from participating in the post-season MHSAA tournament in that sport.

If the second or third ejection occurs during the MHSAA tournament, that coach or player would be ineligible for the remainder of the tournament.

In order for a school to enter or continue in an MHSAA tournament under those circumstances, it would have to agree to prohibit such coaches and players from being present on the property of the tournament venue.

Any coach or player who has been ejected

from a contest for hitting, slapping, kicking, pushing or intentionally and aggressively physically contacting an official at anytime during that season would be prohibited from participating in the MHSAA tournament in that sport, and the school would be responsible for making sure that individual was not present at a tournament site.

Additionally, the council approved proposals to have the names of those schools published in the MHSAA bulletin which receive three or more negative officials' reports in a single school year, and to pub-

lish the names of coaches who are ejected from contests. Last fall sports season alone, 40 schools received three or more negative officials' reports and 62 coaches were ejected from contests.

Cross country and tennis will see major format changes this fall. In cross country, the finals in all classes will be conducted at Michigan International Speedway near Jackson. In tennis, the Class A finals will be conducted in its entirety at the Midland Tennis Center, utilizing all indoor and out-

Golden Fox reaches maturity, develops into fine area course

In all reality, it takes a new golf course three to four years to mature.

Fairways can be made playable and greens smooth in the first few years of operation, but it takes an extended time for kinks to be worked out.

Constructed in 1989, Plymouth's Golden Fox is all grown up.

The links-style course certainly ranks among the area's best public facilities with impeccable design, superb upkeep and friendly service. Simply put, it's wonderful golf.

According to Director of Golf Operations Autumn Keller, folks come from far and wide to play the course.

"We get golfers from all over the place," she said. "Livonia, South Lyon, Farmington, Novi and Plymouth."

Located at 8768 N. Territorial, golfers have been making the trek to Plymouth's far west side for decades.

Fox Hills opened on the site back in the early 1920s as an 18-hole course. Nine holes were added in 1982 and Golden Fox followed a few years later to give the facility 45-holes of golfing paradise.

While Golden Fox is part of the same complex, Keller said it has a much different feel than the other 27 holes. Mounding and undisturbed wetlands give the championship course a distinctive character, she added.

"It's an Arthur Hills design," Keller added. "It was one of his first in the area."

The course's four sets of tees also make it a challenge for many different levels of players.

"From the ladies red tees," Keller said, "I think it's actually easier than Fox Hills. A lot of the trouble is taken out of play."

As you might expect, Golden Fox does plenty of business.

"We have a lot of corporate and charity outings," said Keller. "We have a lot of outings on both courses."

Golden Fox's biggest charity event comes up each Memorial Day with the First of America Challenge. Professional golfers from each major tour, including the PGA, PGA and senior PGA, play in the event. Curtis Strange, Meg Mallon and Jim Colbert are a few who have participated over the years.

"We get a few thousand spectators for it every year," said Keller, adding that money raised from the event goes to the Special Olympics.

While the course does host many outings, a large portion of its business still comes from the general public. And for good reason.

Golden Fox offers a real test for even the best golfers.

Low-handicappers will want to play the gold championship tees, which come in at 6,783 yards. Lesser skill players can choose from the blue or white tees, 6,431 and 6,042 yards respectively.

At 414 yards from those blue tees, No. 1 is the longest par 4 on the front nine. It's an easy driving hole with a large open fairway. The real challenge comes on the second shot where it takes all of a fairway wood to carry over a large pot bunker in front of the green and land safely on the playing surface.

While the first hole is atypical in

terms of yardage, it does reflect Golden Fox's character - open rolling terrain, with just enough trouble to make it interesting.

If you like large targets to shoot at, No. 3 will be your hole. A 161-yard par 3, it offers an inviting, highly undulating green. A sand bunker guards the right side of the green, while a nasty drop faces shots left of the putting surface. Since you're teeing off slightly up hill, play a club less than you'd normally hit from 160 yards.

Speaking of target golf, the 301-yard par 4 fourth is its epitome. The green is at a 90 degree angle from the fairway here making any attempt to drive it impossible.

Instead, golfers must play an iron off the tee and put the ball in a small landing area about 160 yards from the tee. Hit it too far

and your ball will wind up in a bunker or in the woods. From there it's a 9-iron or pitching wedge to the green. Play two smart shots and par shouldn't be a problem here.

Par or birdie isn't unthinkable on the course is No. 15, a 386-yard par 4. Rated as just the 10th hardest hole, it's tougher than you think.

needle in a hay stack.

Golden Fox's back nine doesn't get interesting until you reach the 141-yard 14th. The par 3 is classic golf with a downhill tee shot, stream in front of the green and trouble both left and right.

There's almost no room for error here.

Perhaps the most intriguing hole on the course is No. 15, a 386-yard par 4. Rated as just the 10th hardest hole, it's tougher than you think.

A good drive of 230 or 240 yards should put you in position of an easy second shot into the green. Only one small problem, though.

The green is guarded by a virtual mountain. This is the mother of all berms. Bottom line: it makes that second shot into the green a blind one. It'll take more club than you think to reach the green.

Golden Fox closes with a par 4. At 433 yards, the length makes a bogey a reality for most average golfers.

door courts at that facility. Basketball rule changes from the National Federation of State High School Associations are highlighted by the canceling of free throws when a double technical or simultaneous technical fouls by opponents occur. Free throws will no longer be awarded in those situations.

Other changes include: One official warning before being assessed a technical foul to a team which interferes with a ball after a basket is scored;

• A rule stating that computers, other than for statistical use, or any electronic transmission device, is prohibited at courtside for coaching purposes during a game.

In football, the National Federation adopted a safety rule which provides protection for the snapper in a placekick or punting situation. A defensive player will no longer be able to charge directly into the snapper until the snapper is able to defend himself. This is the same protection afforded kickers and holders, and will result in a 15-yard penalty when called.

trated on his career with Ford after graduation.

But it was his job that eventually brought him back to the track.

The weeks are long for an engineer at Ford. It's not uncommon to put in 60 hours every week, in fact.

Not that Cole minded the hours much. His work for Ford often puts him behind the wheel of company prototypes.

His job is to assess functional aspects of vehicles that might make their way onto the streets and highways of America.

"I'm a link between customers and the design engineers," he said.

In order to do his job better, Ford sent him to Arizona last year to the Boundurant School for high performance driving. The four day course taught techniques to

improve both abilities and skills of students.

"It made me a more confident driver," said Cole, who wound up finishing first in his class. "We learned everything from methods of down-shifting to weight distribution."

It was the Boundurant course that rekindled his desire and confidence to begin racing again.

"What I found was that the elements of a car on pavement are similar to a four-wheeler on dirt," said Cary. "There was nothing mystical or intimidating after all."

By last fall, Cole was back on track. He started racing go-carts after a one-day course.

These aren't the kind that go chug-chug around a bumpy little track. No, sir. Cole went straight into the 12-horsepower, 60 mph room-a-zoom-zoom kind of cars.

The Northville resident recalls being a little uptight before his first

cart race last fall.

"I wasn't scared," said Cole. "A little anxious, maybe. I really wanted to see what it was like with a cart. I had never driven one."

He met with success in eight races late last year and early this spring. Cole garnered a pair of wins and two more top five finishes.

His time with the carts fueled his racing dreams.

"It definitely got me into it," Cary added. "It gave me the confidence that I could get out there and run."

Carts were merely a stepping stone, though. Later this spring, Cole moved on to bigger and better things with the Barber school.

An intensive three-day program prepared students for the formula 2000 series. After passing the course, students get a shot at seven races throughout the Midwest.

Unlike the professional circuits

where big bucks mean big results, each Barber school racer is equipped with identical vehicles. Winners are determined by skill rather than better equipment. In other words.

While placing in the top 10 of his first two races was nice, Cole says the idea is to get his feet wet. He went to Wisconsin last weekend with definite goals in mind.

"I want to get my comfort level with the car up," he said. "I'm going in there to learn."

Cole figures he'll have a shot at winning formula 2000 Dodge open-wheel series next year. If he can pull that off, it'll mean a professional racing scholarship from the Barber school.

"I would get six to eight pro races paid for," Cole said.

Eventually, Cole would like a shot at the big time like the Indy 500.

"That's the dream," he said.

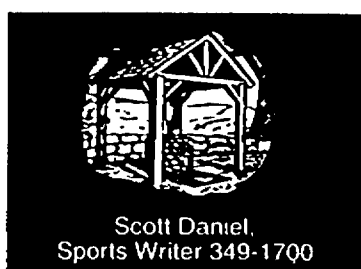

Medical science touts advantages of breastfeeding

Breastfeeding is health promotion in its purest form aiding to improve the health of our community.

Recent advances in technology have enabled scientists to discover the biological differences and the benefits that make breastmilk far superior to formula for infant feeding. The American Academy of Pediatrics now recommends breastfeeding as the preferred form of infant feeding.

From the very first feeding, breastmilk provides babies with a boost to their immune system, providing infection fighting substances. This natural immune boost continues for the duration of breastfeeding. As a result, breastfed infants have fewer ear infections, fewer upper respiratory infections, a decreased severity and incidence of asthma, less diarrhea, and a decreased incidence of childhood cancers. There is research indicating a protective element between breastfeeding and AIDS, juvenile diabetes, ulcerative colitis, breast cancer and multiple sclerosis, as well.

Since breastmilk is made specifically for human babies it is very easily digested and the nutrients are in forms that are readily absorbed and put to use. This easy digestion is less taxing on the infant's developing systems. And breastmilk provides growth hormones to continue the development of body systems that began before birth.

Additionally, since breastmilk is tailor made for the infant, its components are perfectly balanced without deficiencies or excesses. Breastmilk has even been shown to specifically promote brain and central nervous system growth so necessary for human infants.

Mothers also benefit from breastfeeding. Early on breastfeeding assists in controlling the blood loss after delivery as well as returning the uterus to its prepregnancy size. Other advantages include a decreased incidence of postpartum depression, and postpartum weight loss. Long term benefits include a decreased risk of ovarian, breast and uterine cancers, and decreased risk of osteoporosis.

For many years researchers have known that a close bond between mother and infant is essential for the healthy growth and development of the child.

Breastfeeding is a powerful way to forge that bond, providing both the physical contact and hormonal influences needed.

The advance in technology combined with an increased need has led to the development of several efficient, easy-to-use breastpumps, making continued breastfeeding an easy option for the working mother.

While breastfeeding is natural, it is a learned art. Many women have an easier route to successful breastfeeding when they have access to support and assistance.

Good oral hygiene should last forever

For most of this century it was thought that as people grew older their dental health would inevitably decline. They would surely lose their teeth, develop mouth infections (including periodontal, or gum, disease; cavities; yeast growths, dry mouth; and decreased taste, swallowing and chewing function).

But dental researchers today know better. No longer is it accepted that the condition of one's mouth has to deteriorate as one gets older. Good dental health can be maintained in all adults, regardless of age.

More and more older adults are keeping their teeth compared to previous generations. This is due to greater access to dental care, fluoridation of public water, improved knowledge about preventing dental diseases and increased dental insurance.

However, older adults are more susceptible than younger adults to developing gum infections and dental cavities, since they have numerous medical problems and take many drugs that may have harmful effects on oral health.

Therefore, it is particularly important for older adults to see their dentist every six

months to maintain the health of their mouth. Early cavities and gum infections can be identified and treated conservatively, which increases the likelihood that adults can keep their natural teeth and enjoy the benefits of eating, chewing, swallowing, speaking and socializing without poorly fitting dentures.

If dentures do become necessary, it is important to remember that if they do not fit well, they should be adjusted or, if necessary, remade. This will help avoid other mouth problems such as ulcers and even bone loss in the jaw. Even if a person has no teeth and is wearing complete dentures, he or she still needs to see a dentist once a year so that a cancer-screening exam can be provided and any denture problems can be treated before they cause permanent damage.

Finally, there are some oral diseases that increase with age. Oral cancer and other oral mucosal diseases (such as lichen planus, pemphigus and pemphigoid) must be identified early so as to avoid permanent damage from the disease or its treatment.

The risk of developing an oral cancer increases dramatically with age, alcohol intake and

tobacco use. If a person notices a red or white lesion in their mouth and it persists for more than two weeks, they should have it examined by a dentist.

The Department of Hospital Dentistry at the U-M Hospitals specializes in the dental and oral medical care of older adults, especially those with multiple medical problems. Clinical, teaching and research programs are currently improving the knowledge of the oral health of older adults and are helping to diagnose and treat dental disorders in the geriatric population.

The new U-M Cancer Center and Geriatrics Center, to be completed early next year, also will include a new diagnostic and treatment center dedicated to the dental and oral health problems of the elderly.

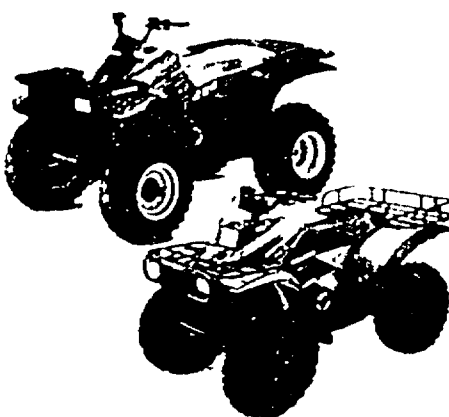

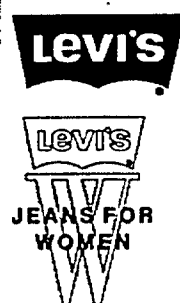

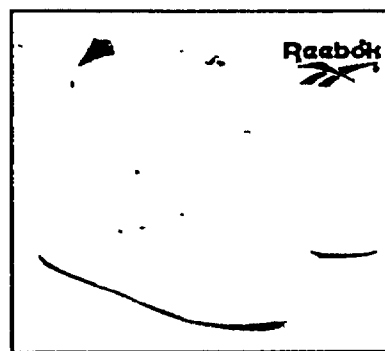

Rabbit woes wreak havoc on garden

A beautiful garden is a delight to homeowners and their neighbors.

Unfortunately, four-legged inhabitants often enjoy the same turf. Whether or not these creatures are welcomed depends on the homeowner.

Sandra Mohr of Northville has a soft, big-eyed little rabbit, as she calls him, who visits the garden that was lovingly planted by her husband, her oldest and youngest sons, and her middle son and his fiancé.

Mohr has found her asters eaten to the ground by this new boarder. He finished the brown-eyed Susans off in two meals.

"I buy new ones and plunk them in the holes," she said.

One of her sons thought it would be a nice idea to surprise Mohr with a new sunflower plant. She was amazed at the plant, and that the bunny had seen it before she had and ate right through the middle of it.

"He likes to snap the neck," Mohr said. "I think he likes the crunch."

Although Mohr believes that "we are all God's creatures," she wants this particular creature to move on to greener pastures.

She is finding it very trying to give "forgiveness and unconditional love" to the rabbit. She tried to entice him away from her flowers by leaving carrots out for him. But in the morning she found the carrots

uneaten three feet from his nose and petals in his mouth.

Mohr is definitely not alone in her dilemma.

"We've created an urban wildlife problem," said Glenn Cutright, owner of Ann Arbor Wildlife Services, urban wildlife managers. "We need to learn to coexist with them."

The most common troublemakers are the raccoon and the squirrel, followed by the skunk," according to Cutright.

Rabbits are fairly easy to deal with, Cutright, who used to capture and relocate animals, says it is easy to control them by exclusion, the method he now uses.

Short, little fencing which is slightly rounded is sufficient to keep rabbits out but it is not enough to discourage a woodchuck or a deer.

Rabbits are fairly simple creatures and feed close to their holes, according to Cutright. They are also very habitual.

"They find something they like to eat and they will eat it until it's gone," Cutright said.

Capturing and removing one animal that is a nuisance will not solve the problem. It becomes a perpetual trapping job because another animal will come in.

The problem is the food source. Instead of capturing the animals, which sometimes can be difficult, Cutright will kick them out and enclose the area with appropriate fencing.

Then the animals move on and the customer has a long-term solution, according to Cutright.

"The big problem is that most people don't want to go that extra mile. And the aesthetic value ... people don't like the fence," he said.

There are both safe and harmful products on the market to prevent animals from coming back. Homeowners need to decide how much time they want to put into it. For instance, does the customer want to reapply the product when it is washed away by a rainfall?

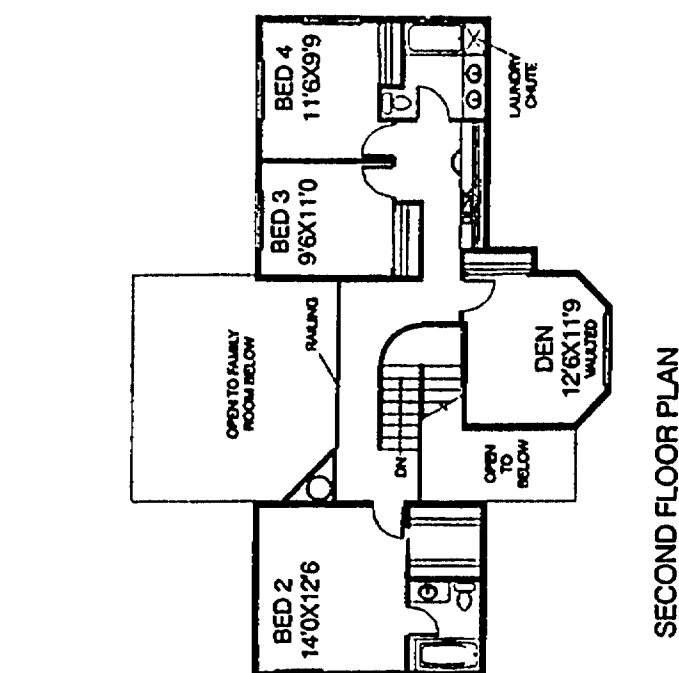
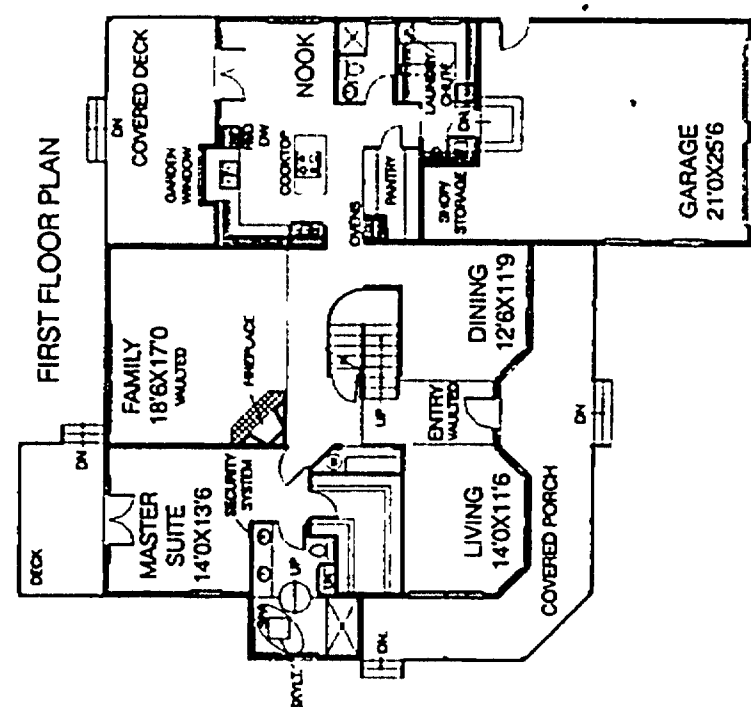
"It is a bandage affect," Cutright said.

Urban sprawl is eliminating the predators of small animals, and with the ban on hunting and the addition of more food and water sources such as man-made ponds, new habitats have been created for these animals. The car has become the only predator for some.

"We've altered our habitat to be much better for these wildlife species that they have learned to coexist with us," Cutright said. "They don't mind that we are close by. Food, water and shelter is what they are looking for and we created it for them."

Cutright set a trap for the bunny, but he refused to take the bait.

"Why (would a rabbit) go into a steel cage when there's so much food," Cutright said.

Windowboxes can be a quick facelift for the home

Need a quick, practical way to give your house a face lift? Why not consider window boxes. They're small investments that pay big returns in beauty and color for the house.

One of the truly amazing characteristics of window boxes is their amazing versatility. They can have interesting shapes and be designed in a rainbow of colors. They can be filled with plants for every area from sun to shade. Window boxes should be a statement of personal style, whether they bring a whimsical spot of color to a weekend retreat on the shore or complement the front of a formal apartment in the city.

INSTALLATION HINTS

Be sure that your window box has drainage holes to allow excess water to drain away from delicate plant roots. Cover the drainage holes with fine mesh to keep potting mix from draining out.

The window box should extend the entire length of your window. Attach the window box to the house using wood screws. Include a 1-inch

spacer to protect your home from moisture. Place the window box so that the top edge is just below the windowsill.

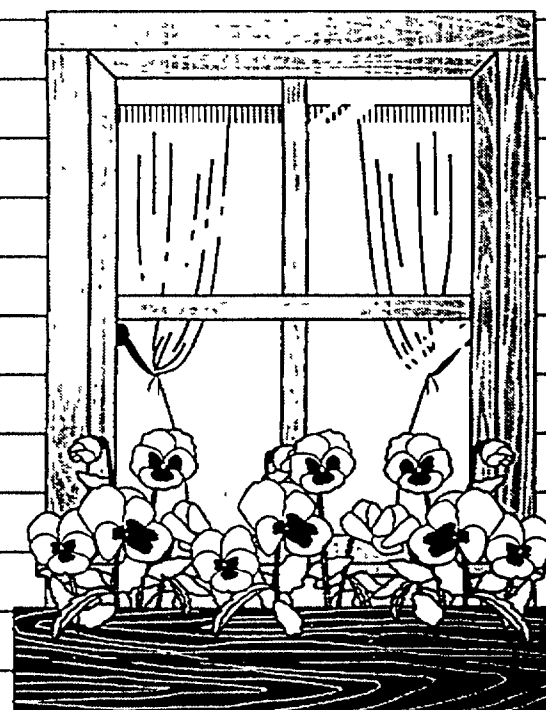
The secret of lush window boxes is overcrowding. The plants like to be jammed together tightly. Arrange plants just like a picture; tall ones in the back, short ones in the front. A well-balanced window box will include plants for the back of the box that grow up right, while center plants should have a mounding habit and the front plants should trail.

Water plants well before planting so that the potting medium will cling to roots and bare roots will not be exposed to air. For the first few weeks after planting, make sure that the potting medium is kept moist.

The soil in a window box dries out quicker than soil around plants in the ground because a window box is exposed to air on most sides. Water by touch, not by sight. If the potting mix feels dry at a depth of 1 inch, it's watering time. After several weeks of watering, plants in window

Successful window boxes

- Boxes must drain well without letting dirt fall out the bottom. Box should be set off from the house slightly and should run the length of the window. Place the box below the windowsill.
- Place tall plants in the back, mounding plants in the middle and trailing plants to the front. Overcrowding is recommended.
- Use a peat-based potting mix.
- Water plants frequently when first planted and then when soil is dry at a depth of 1 inch. You may need a watering wand for high-mounted boxes. Establish a regular fertilizing program.
- Window boxes may be traditional or avant-garde. Try to match them to the style of your house.

Is Popeye a good sale, or man?

Q. I have had this wind-up "Popeye" toy since I was a child. He is 7 inches tall and walks when wound-up. It was made by J. Cheln & Co. in the USA and copyrighted in 1932 by King Features Syndicate Inc. He is in excellent condition. What is its value?

A. Cheln and company manufactured toys from the 1930s to the 1940s. Popeye-related toys are very popular collectibles. The value of your toy would probably be about \$675 to \$775.

Q. I inherited an Oriental vase from a friend. She told me that she bought it at an auction about 60 years ago. The height is 14 inches. The upper portion is decorated with a purple and green glaze. The lower two-thirds has figures in relief of monkeys playing against a red-orange background. What can you tell me about my vase?

A. Your vase is an example of Sumida Gawa ware. In 1895 a Japanese potter and his son began producing this style of pottery near the banks of the Sumida River (Sumida Gawa), close to Tokyo. Sumida Gawa pottery and porcelain is characterized by the flame drip glazes, red-orange background, and applied figures in relief. Your vase was made around 1900. It would probably be worth about \$1,500 to \$2,000.

Q. Several years ago I purchased a Victorian silver plate butter dish. The lid is engraved with flowers and is

raised by turning a knob. Water lilies are applied on either side of the handles. On each side of the base of the handle there is a head of a cow. Also on each side of the handles are butter knife rests. The base of the butter dish is footed. The bottom of the dish is marked "MFD & Plated by Reed & Barton." What is my butter dish worth?

A. Victorian table accessories were often elaborate and decorative. Imaginative utensils were designed for every course of the meal. The Victorians were especially fond of those accessories that had wheels, knobs, or handles. If a piece served a two-fold function, that was even better. The cow motif was inspired by the source of butter. Your butter dish was made in the late 1800s. It would probably be worth from \$200 to \$275.

Q. These words are on the bottom of a teapot that my mother gave me 40 years ago. The tea pot is 7 inches tall and is decorated with a scene of a young woman with two geese in front of a

colonial home. I am curious about its origin and value.

A. Edwin M. Knowles China Co. manufactured semi-vitreous china in Chester and Newell, W. Va. He was the son of one of the founders of the Knowles, Taylor, Knowles China Co., which was in business from 1900 to 1963. In the late 1930s the Edwin M. Knowles China Co. was second only to Homer Laughlin in manufacturing dinnerware. Although the firm was liquidated, the rights to the Knowles name was sold to a distributor of collector plates. This mark was registered in 1939. Your tea pot would probably be worth from \$35 to \$45.

Q. We have a hair wreath that has been in our family since 1887. It is human hair that has been woven into an intricate design. The wreath is mounted in an octagonal frame that is 6 inches deep and 20 inches in diameter. I would appreciate your estimate as to its rarity and value.

A. The craft of weaving and braiding hair into jewelry and wreaths had a short life. It was

popular from the late 1800s to about 1900. These mementos are not considered particularly rare. Hair wreaths were usually made from the hair of the deceased. They were often mounted in deep satin-lined shadow boxes. Your framed hair wreath would probably be worth about \$150 to \$200.

Local real estate markets rapidly become part of international market

Local real estate markets throughout the United States are rapidly becoming integral segments of an international market. And that has a strong impact on the sale of high-end residential properties, as well as commercial and resort real estate.

"There's a growing movement by Realtors throughout the nation to establish international councils," said John Tuccillo, chief economist for the National

Association of Realtors. "And that's a positive sign that foreign direct investment, immigration and international real estate educational programs are having a positive effect in our country."

Real estate brokers increasingly are using computerized information systems to market properties worldwide, thus providing an enhanced marketing service for their clients. Brokers who previously focused their entire efforts within their immediate marketing area are now reaching out to the international market, thanks to computer

communication capabilities.

Expensive, high-end homes are often purchased by buyers from foreign countries — individuals and families planning a move to the United States. And many foreign investors are still actively pursuing the acquisition of commercial and resort properties in this country.

"Commerce Department statistics show foreign investment plays an important role in U.S. real estate, but in no way do foreigners control the market," Tuccillo said. He noted that foreign ownership of domestic real estate has steadily declined

since 1990, when it was nearly \$45 billion. In 1994, foreign ownership of real estate was valued at \$28.4 billion.

Japan held 34 percent of foreign-owned real estate in the United States in 1994 — down from 45.8 percent in 1990. The amount of money that flows across the ocean varies greatly from year to year and country to country. But with steadily developing information systems coming on board, real estate activity on an international level is on the increase.

Families moving from one

country to another often face a severe case of sticker-shock when seeking a home and learning about the cost of living in their new home area.

For example, for an average family of two living in Atlanta, the annual cost of living is about \$56,000. In Tokyo, the average cost of living is \$160,000. Other areas include: Montreal, \$51,000; Seoul (South Korea), \$155,000; Moscow, \$124,000; Mexico City, \$59,000; Sydney (Australia), \$70,400.

The cost of living figures were provided by Runzheimer International, relocation specialists.

With the increasing cost of buying and maintaining a vaca-

tion property, many families are discovering they can create a vacation atmosphere in their own back yard.

"Why build a cabin in the mountains or a cottage by the sea when you can create a cozy retreat as close as your own back yard?" asks "Home Front" newsletter, published by Better Homes and Gardens Real Estate Service and distributed by its member Realtors.


Use a peat-based potting mix because it retains moisture yet allows proper aeration of roots. Watering wands are great for this chore, especially for difficult to reach window boxes

communication capabilities.

Expensive, high-end homes are often purchased by buyers from foreign countries — individuals and families planning a move to the United States. And many foreign investors are still actively pursuing the acquisition of commercial and resort properties in this country.

"Commerce Department statistics show foreign investment plays an important role in U.S. real estate, but in no way do foreigners control the market," Tuccillo said. He noted that foreign ownership of domestic real estate has steadily declined

since 1990, when it was nearly \$45 billion. In 1994, foreign ownership of real estate was valued at \$28.4 billion.

Japan held 34 percent of foreign-owned real estate in the United States in 1994 — down from 45.8 percent in 1990. The amount of money that flows across the ocean varies greatly from year to year and country to country. But with steadily developing information systems coming on board, real estate activity on an international level is on the increase.

Families moving from one

country to another often face a severe case of sticker-shock when seeking a home and learning about the cost of living in their new home area.

For example, for an average family of two living in Atlanta, the annual cost of living is about \$56,000. In Tokyo, the average cost of living is \$160,000. Other areas include: Montreal, \$51,000; Seoul (South Korea), \$155,000; Moscow, \$124,000; Mexico City, \$59,000; Sydney (Australia), \$70,400.

The cost of living figures were provided by Runzheimer International, relocation specialists.





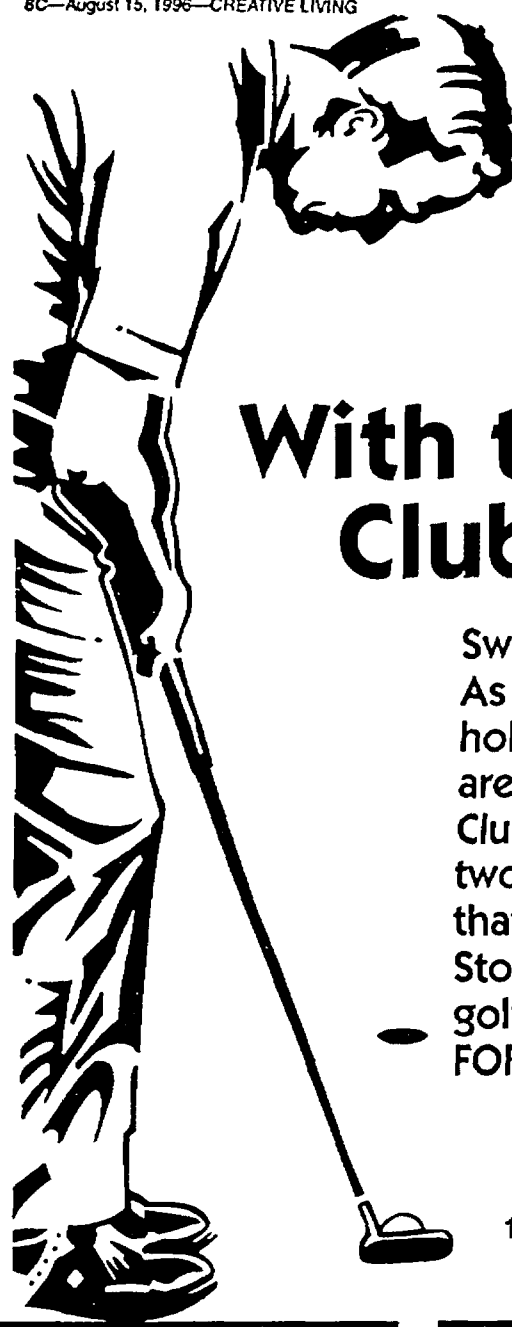

Clinic provides easy access to vet services

Treating your child's high temperature, your spouse's cough or your own headache are pretty simple procedures. A trip to the corner drug store or a visit to the doctor's office is usually more than enough to cure common family ailments. But what do you do when Fido the puppy or Fluffy the kitty are sick?

Finding top-notch treatment for your pet just got easier.

Briarpointe Veterinary Clinic opened its doors in early June at the corner of Ten Mile and Beck roads in Novi. Co-owner Ronald Studer said he hopes the business will grow roots in the community.

"Long term," the doctor of veterinary medicine said, "we would like for this to be an on-going practice that provides high quality care. We want to provide timely and effective service."

Opening the clinic was about a two-year process for Studer and partner John Parker.

The duo run the Pearce Veterinary Hospital in Southfield. Studer said he and Parker began kicking around the idea for expansion years ago.

Finally about two years ago they got serious. Continued growth in the area as well as accessibility of the Ten Mile-Beck

Road site convinced the partners to come to Novi.

Plans for the clinic were initially rejected by the town's city council. But Parker and Studer resubmitted plans after receiving community support through a survey they conducted.

"We came to the conclusion that (the clinic) wasn't something we wanted to give up," Studer said.

By March work on the facility, which is located at 47330 Ten Mile Road in the Briarpointe Plaza, began. The clinic then opened on June 6.

"For only being open a short time," Studer said, "we've had a really good response."

Establishing a veterinary clinic isn't an overnight process, however. Parker said the office probably won't make a profit for several years.

Building trust among clients and patients, for that matter, will go a long way in determining the clinic's success. The duo's vast experience in the field should help in that regard.

Studer received his doctorate in veterinary medicine from Michigan State University in 1973. He began work at Pearce Hospital shortly afterwards and has treated small animals of every kind since then.

Parker also received his doctorate from

MSU. After graduating in 1988, he worked with horses in Ohio then smaller animals in Illinois.

Parker enjoyed his work in Illinois. But he drove lots of miles to see patients in the state's rural areas. Tiring of the travel, he came back to Michigan and Pearce Hospital.

"I didn't go to school to become a truck driver," he said.

Parker had worked in the hospital during his college years. He and Studer developed a friendship that eventually led to owning Pearce and opening the Novi clinic.

"We have a good rapport," said Studer.

Which makes for a better environment for their patients. The partners offer a wide variety of services at Briarpointe Clinic.

An office visit for a sick pet is \$29.50. Pets can be vaccinated for \$23, distemper is \$18, rabies shots are \$12 for one year and \$16 for three.

Cats and dogs can be spayed or neutered.

Dogs up to 25 pounds are spayed for \$90. 26 to 50 pounds are \$120. 51-75 pounds are \$130, and dogs over 75 pounds must be evaluated by a doctor. Dog neuterings are \$95.

Cats can be spayed for \$90 and neutered for \$55. Front declawing is \$90.

In Pinewood, it is such a wonderful public-private partnership, that we wanted to be involved," Paul said. "And our involvement in Pinewood made possible another Robertson project within The Pheasant Run development—The Links."

The Links is a golf course community that offers 218 condominiums in three different styles: 2 and 3 bedroom single-story ranches, two-story and story and a half models. One third of the condominiums back up to or have direct access to a golf course; the remaining two thirds of the condominiums back up to a portion of the Rouge River or other wooded areas.

One of the developments that exemplifies Robertson Brothers' presence in older, more established areas is The Glens—set to open in Troy in late September. Like The Links, The Glens (as is the case with all the Robertson Brothers properties) makes the most of its natural environment. In fact, The Crossings features a "pathway" system that winds through the development, showing off the 40 percent of the land that's made up of open space, streams and ponds."

Also in Troy, the highest end of The Robertson Brothers spectrum: Northpointe Village. Northpointe's second phase is ready to hit the market this August. Located at Big Beaver and Adams in the Birmingham School District, Northpointe's second phase features 19 exclusive units priced from the mid \$500s and is far more "custom" than other comparable communities. Northpointe features 77-foot lots and a variety of lush amenities.

What's next for today's Robertson brothers? A lakefront development in Orion Township and yet another 46-unit project in Canton Township.

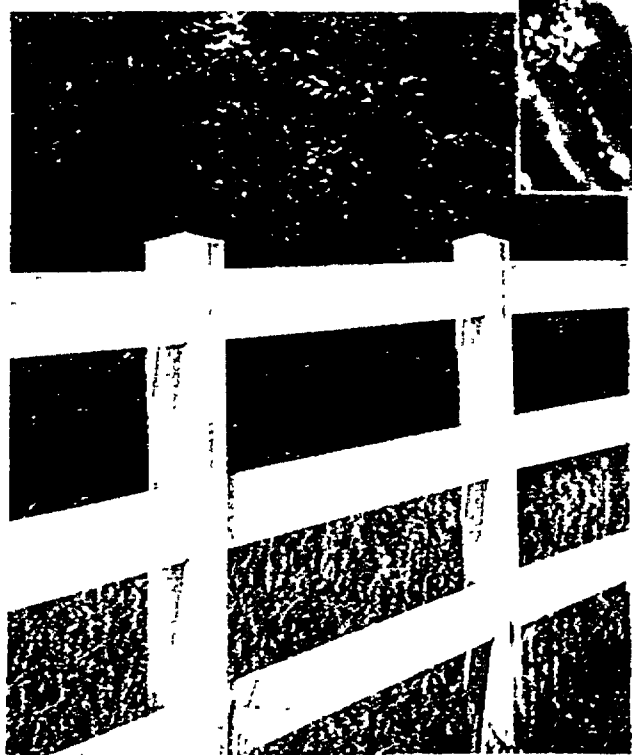

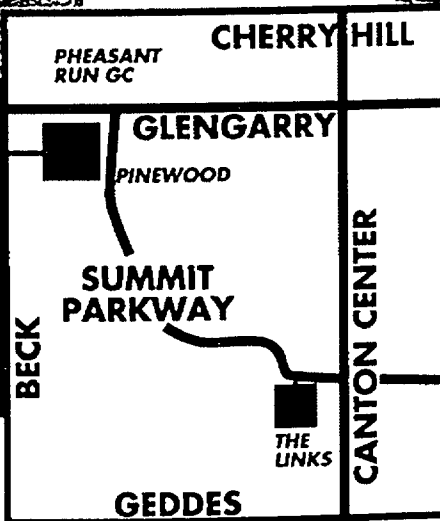

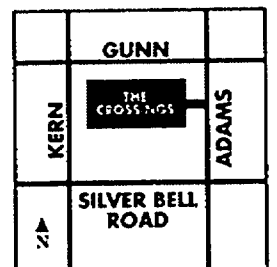

"The real difference between what we do, and traditional log homes comes in the drying process," Grajek said.

"Because of the complete kiln drying, we don't have to leave allowances for shrinkage around doors and windows.

"And we also use a double tongue-and-groove connection between the timbers," he said, "as well as an S-joint at the junction of each timber, and dove tail joints at the corners to ensure a tight fit."

The S-joint, Grajek explained, is much like a clasping handshake, with the end of two timbers interlocking in an "S" shape, while the dove tail corner joints are like that used by fine wood workers and cabinet makers.

Behind the connection systems, Grajek's company also employs exclusive "post and beam construction" that eliminates the need for interior load-bearing walls. "In this way, we can create immense open spaces with cathedral ceilings with unlimited design capabilities," he said.

Grajek explained that this adds to the romance of having a log home. Along with the cedar walls all the way around, the true essence of a log home is brought to life.

In addition, post-beam construction no longer makes internal floorplans a final decision.

And, for those of you who want the beauty of cedar but the lower cost of a stick-built home, Grajek also works with cedar sided homes which gives the same warmth in wood, and post and beam construction.

So, for those looking for their dreamhouse made in the natural beauty of wood, the old fashioned Paul Bunion has moved into the future with a whole new style. ■



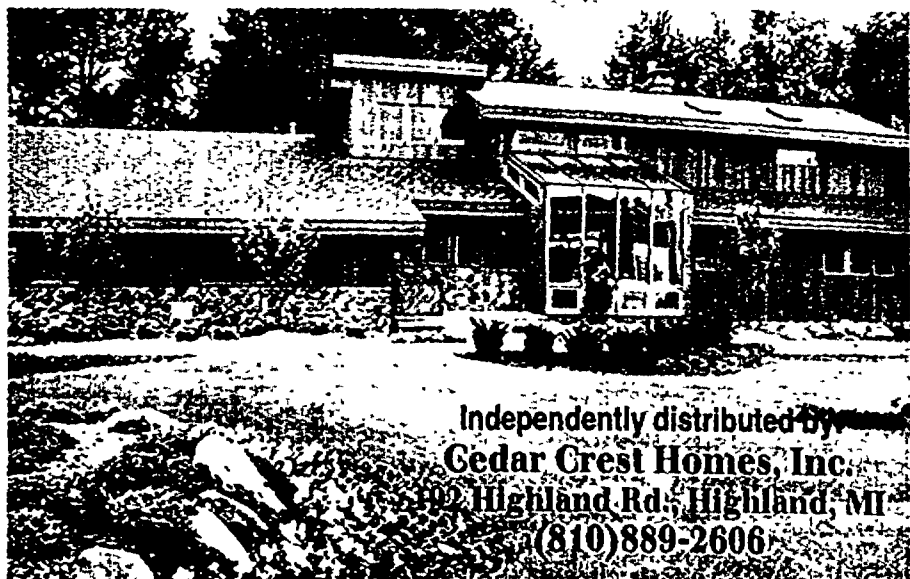

Tee Time: Golf Course Living

Buying a home is like buying a small piece of the world: your world. The home building industry in Michigan has taken hold of a concept to make close community living more of exactly that. In southeastern Michigan, new homebuyers are looking to move farther away from the hustle and bustle of city life. But most are not willing to give up the convenience of living close to the amenities that accompany urban living.

Today, homes are being built as part of a package deal. No longer is it about buying a lot and then building a home. People are looking for a more well-rounded atmosphere. And with that, builders are now giving you far more for your money: they give you a lifestyle.

With everything from a fine dining facility clubhouse, to an 18-hole golf course in your backyard, "lifestyle living" has reached Michigan in full force.

In southeastern Michigan alone, these developments have been coming to life in droves. To name a few, The Glacier Club in Macomb County, The

Links in Canton, Prestwick Village Golf Club in Highland Township and The Fairways in Canton.

It once was believed that to live in this type of atmosphere you would retire and move south to a golfing community.

However, the developments today are more than just retirement communities. According to Roy Gaddey of Prestwick Village, "It isn't just the older generation or 'empty nesters' who are looking to live with these luxuries and conveniences. We have a majority of families here, which I think is a great thing, to see people enjoying more of what a beautiful

community atmosphere can give them."

Gaddey also commented, many assume, with Michigan's seasons being so brief, a golf course would be undesirable to live on. To the contrary: golfing is actually #2 in popular sporting events in all of Michigan.

You don't have to be wealthy to afford these types of amenities. With the trend for these developments increasing, the median cost for this type of living starts in the \$260s. These days, that is considered only a medium to lower-upper income level.

What Is A "Site-Built" Condo?

Site Built Condominiums By The Irvine Group

Once in a great while, a new idea or a way of doing something comes along that has great benefits and virtually no drawbacks. The "site condominium" is one of those ideas. But few housing concepts are more misunderstood by both buyers and real estate professionals than this one.

In Michigan, parcels of land can be divided into smaller individual building sites either through the "plat" process or as a condominium. A single family site condominium subdivision is virtually identical to a platted subdivision. The only real difference is that the "lots" or "sites" are divided and recorded by condominium documents rather than a "plat." Buyers have their own site (often known as a "unit") with their own lot lines. Lot sizes are governed by the same local zoning restrictions that would apply to platted subdivisions. They may be designed to be less than a quarter acre or up to many acres in size for each site. The distinction between platted and site condo subdivisions only involves the legal division and conveyance of the land itself, and it has nothing to do with the homes that are built.

The roads in the development may be public or private. If private, then the

homeowners' association owns and maintains them. The roads, as in any other subdivision, must be built to local or county road standards. Some people mistakenly believe that since roads in a platted subdivision are mostly public, they are fully maintained by the governmental authority at no cost to the homeowners. In fact, most subdivisions pay for a private snow removal company and any major road repairs are often assessed to the homeowners with little or no say in the cost, quality or timing of the work. At least in a site condominium, the owners can have much more control over their own community.

Site condo subdivisions are very popular and are gaining in use. The main reason a developer may choose the site condo method is because it removes some of the bureaucratic delays involved with state, county and local department agencies under the platting process. This form of development

allows the developer to save time and money which in turn enables him to provide a more affordable lot. All of the

engineering and development work including water, sewer and drainage systems are approved and inspected just as in a platted subdivision. There is no difference whatsoever in the quality received.

The homeowners are responsible for their own landscaping, snow removal and maintenance of their home and property just as in any subdivision. Also, like any subdivi-

sion, they are also responsible as members of the homeowners' association for their share of the maintenance of the common elements which are all of the areas outside of the units themselves. The unit is essentially equivalent to the size of the lot.

Monthly or yearly association fees are usually established and may cover the maintenance of the landscaping,

Ask the Builder

Q: Help! I need some expert advice and simple solutions to an ongoing problem in my home...clutter! We don't have a basement so we're interested in easy, effective and relatively inexpensive ways to better organize and store our possessions, particularly in the kitchen (where my countertops are so crowded they're no longer functional and are barely visible)!

A: There are an abundance of ways to better utilize available storage space in your home as well as to create new areas and methods of storage. Over the last several years, manufacturers have created solutions to reduce clutter. For example:

- Pull-out shelves and baskets are available in a wide range of sizes and offer versatile uses in the kitchen. A pull-out shelf next to your kitchen sink can hold large bins for trash and recyclables and another next to your oven can hold pots, pans and casseroles.
- If your pantry is overflowing, select another drawer near your oven to create a handy...as well as hidden...spice rack. Store your spices and seasonings horizontally with the labels up instead of searching through rows of bottles on a crowded pantry shelf.
- Install a pull-out cutting board under a portion of your kitchen counter. It can slide out of view when not in use and also double as extra counter space when needed.
- Today's kitchens have become the favorite "hub" for family gatherings and activities. Since so much time is spent there, create small compartments above a counter or desk to hold mail, grocery lists, keys, cookbooks and other items frequently placed on countertops.
- Seldom-used small appliances, such as blenders, waffle irons or cuisinarts, that are taking up valuable countertop space can be stored in a convenient cabinet which contains electrical outlets in the rear. The appliances can remain plugged in and ready to use when needed.
- Creating built-in seating on a hinged

bench offers another creative way to store items taking up valuable space on your kitchen.

There are several retailers in our area who specialize in storage systems where you can see some of the specialized storage options now available. Building material stores also offer a wide range of shelving, storage and clutter control systems.

Q: We're excited to be building a new home...as well as a bit overwhelmed...about the prospect of decorating it ourselves. We're "starting from scratch" and would appreciate a few design pointers to help get us started.

A: Try to remain undaunted by this exciting undertaking! Transforming a new house into a home that truly reflects your taste and lifestyle can be extremely fulfilling. But you do have a big job ahead of you so here are a few suggestions to keep in mind when you feel overwhelmed:

- Relax and have fun! Decorating a home is an evolutionary process that is impossible to complete in a day, one month or even a year.
- Decide what color schemes and styles you like by pursuing magazines as well as your wardrobe which is an excellent indicator of your personal taste.
- Make a wish list for each room and then break the list down into the essentials that need to be completed first.
- Buy new but keep an open mind about hand-me-downs from family and friends as well as flea market finds. An eclectic mix of furnishings and accents can add quite a bit of interest and establish your home's unique personality.
- One of the best ways to fill an empty space is to install window treatments and cover walls with wallpaper or fabric.

Q: We hear so much today about "hazardous waste" polluting our environment. Are the household products most consumers use today considered hazardous?

A: If improperly handled, there are probably many potentially hazardous household products in your home right now. These would include such items as pesticides, herbicides, wood preservatives, paints and paint thinners, fuels, cleaning solvents and fertilizers.

Hazardous waste products meet certain criteria, including:

- Any chemical that is toxic to humans or animals when inhaled, ingested or when in contact with skin.
- Any material that gives off toxic chemicals when dissolved in landfills (or other acidic areas).
- Any gas or liquid that is ignitable and any solid material that, under ordinary temperatures or pressures, could easily ignite.
- Any waste that contributes reactive gas to a fire (such as oxygen).
- Materials and chemicals that react violently and/or produce dangerous fumes when mixed with water.
- Highly caustic or acidic materials.

It is always a good idea to purchase products that are environmentally safe. Application instructions should always be followed carefully and correctly and all of a product should be used before discarding the container. ■

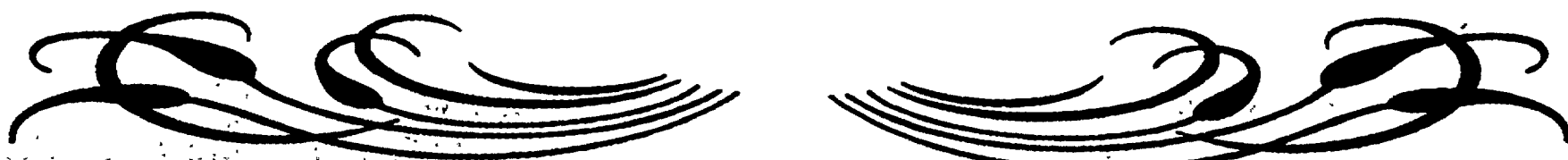

lighting and signage at the entrances as well as maintenance and snow removal of the roads. After the developer has completed the community, association fees can only be increased if the owners vote to increase them in order to balance the budget.

As with any subdivision, there are usually rights and protections by way of deed restrictions. All of the rights and protections listed in the Master Deed allow the homeowners to have control of the community through an association. If a homeowner is not complying with the Master Deed and does not react to neighborly persuasion, the provisions are beneficial to the residents and will allow the neighborhood to be as pleasant and beautiful as possible, helping to retain its highest value and enhance the enjoyment of its owners.

Buyers do receive an individual warranty deed for their property. Owners are responsible for the maintenance of their own property and may landscape as they wish, subject to the Master Deed protections which

usually provide for an architectural and landscape committee. This is not much different than most newer planned subdivisions. The builder or developer generally controls the approvals until a certain percentage of the sites have been sold. In addition, unit owners own an undivided percentage of interest in the common areas as expressed in the Master Deed. This may include private roads, entrance structures, park areas or recreation facilities.

Some site condominiums differ from this scenario in one way or another. Occasionally, exteriors of the homes are designed to look alike and maintenance of the exteriors or the landscaping is included as an association responsibility. Sometimes the definition of the "unit" will compromise an area that differs from the "lot line" boundaries. The sales representative should be able to explain

exactly how their particular community works. In any case, the actual conditions will be fully disclosed in the Master Deed which must be given to every buyer nine business days

before their purchase becomes firm. As in any real estate purchase, buyers should consult a professional if there is anything they don't fully understand.

Generally, the site condominium offers greater control in assuring maintenance

of the overall appearance of the community, thus helping to insure the value of the property over time. Cost savings to the developer due to the shorter time required to gain approvals, often results in lower home prices. This is a fine method of dividing property and will continue to grow. ■

Housing Costs: *On The Rise*

The cost of a new home these days is in the minds of most of America. According to the Federal Housing Finance Board, the average price of housing, nationally, passed the \$160,000 level in the first quarter, which is the largest year-to-year jump so far this decade.

According to the latest government figures, the average price of new and used houses was \$160,000 as of March 31. That is a 6.6% increase from \$150,200 on the same date a year ago. It also follows a 4% year-to-year increase that was recorded in last year's fourth quarter.

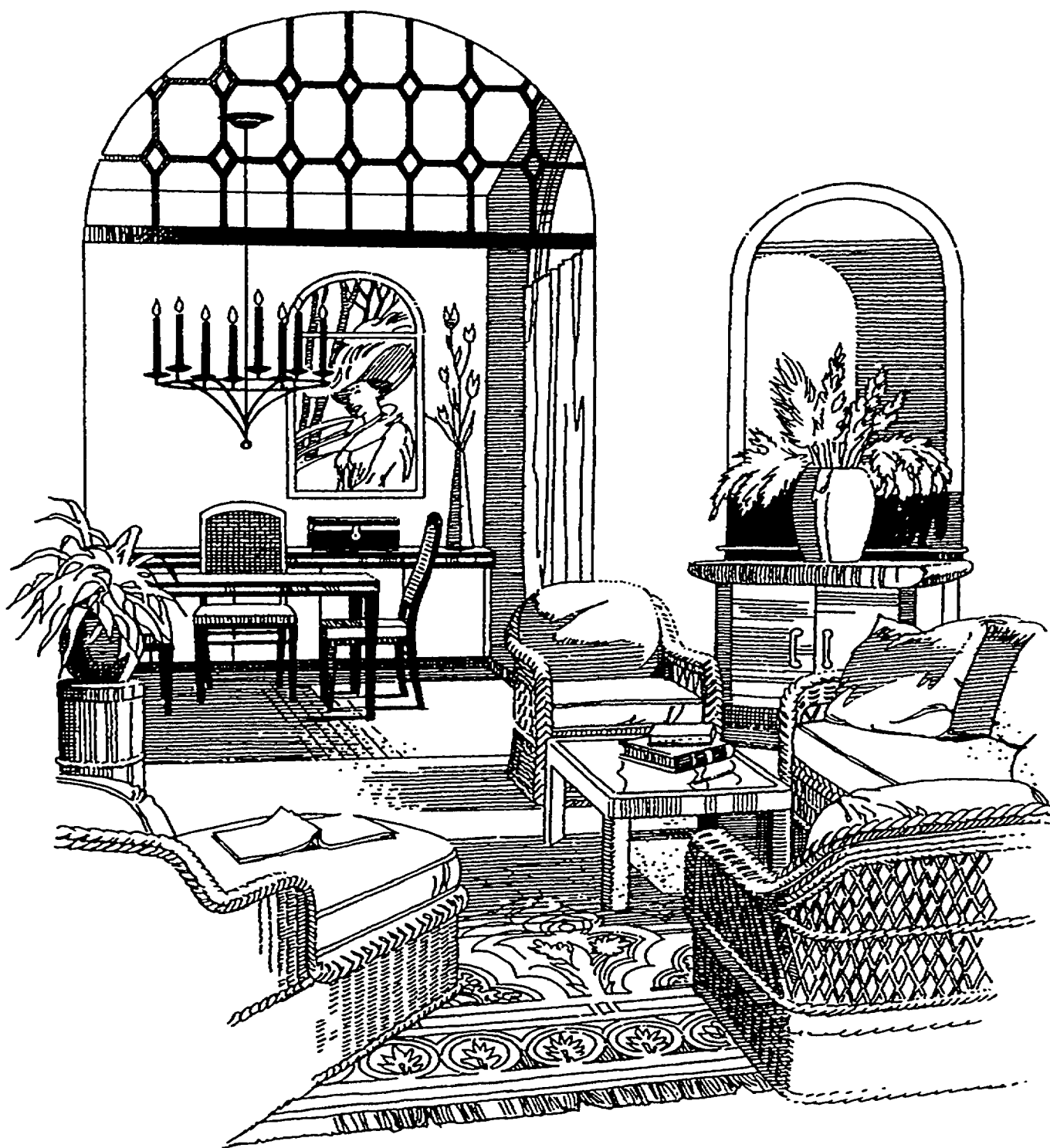
The largest rise in housing prices registered in the '90s occurred five years ago in 1991, when the average price jumped 5.3%.

The latest increase, and the one before it, were brought on by relatively low mortgage rates. But rates have been rising since mid-February so its unlikely that prices will continue to rise at such an alarming rate.

Always be cautious when reviewing statistics of this nature, because it takes many years to establish true fluctuations in the market. At this time, the activity is mostly in the higher price levels, more so than in the actual price of inflation.

Hints For Homeowners

Replace Bursting Bubbles Affordably With New Watertight Skylights

NAPS—Imagine being able to enjoy spectacular views of starry skies, snowy nights or Fall foliage all from inside your own home. Sound impossible? It's not. All you need is a skylight.

Affordable, easy to install and maintain, skylights can brighten up any room while increasing the value of your home. In addition, many manufacturers have taken the suspense out of skylight performance by designing them to be leakproof, energy-efficient and durable enough to withstand extreme weather conditions.

And if you have an old-fashioned single-pane glass skylight or plastic bubble skylight installed, you can end frustrating energy loss and possible leaks by simply replacing your outdated skylights with these new weather-tight models.

The cost to replace old skylights is often a pleasant surprise to homeowners. The average cost of replacing a two-foot by four-foot bubble with a fixed skylight (one that cannot be opened) is under \$500 and slightly more for steep or flat roofs.

A ventilating skylight, commonly used in high-humidity areas such as kitchens and bathrooms, costs about \$650 for the same application.

Manufacturers are now designing skylights with insulated, argon-filled glass panes that feature energy-efficient coatings. These coatings prevent heat gain in summer months by blocking most of the sun's infrared energy from entering the home, and heat loss in winter by reflecting warm air back in the home, reducing heating and cooling bills. Glass skylights seem to provide a clearer view and more light than plastic skylights.

Because skylight flashing (or waterproofing) systems have improved tremendously, skylights can now be easily installed with any type roofing material including metal, asphalt or fiberglass shingles, slate, cedar shingles, Spanish and concrete tiles. Flashing is usually made of aluminum and prevents the entry of moisture into the home from around skylights and other openings in the roof.

For the most weathertight and durable skylight installation with thin roofing materials such as asphalt or fiberglass shingles, L-shaped step flashing pieces of roll-formed aluminum are interwoven with the roofing to create a completely watertight seal without caulk or mastics.

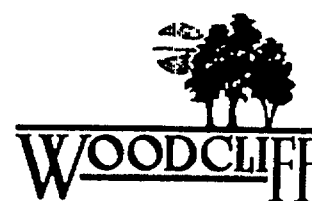
For metal and high profile roofs made of concrete or Spanish tile, the installer forms the pliable flashing to the contour of the roofing material for a weathertight seal.

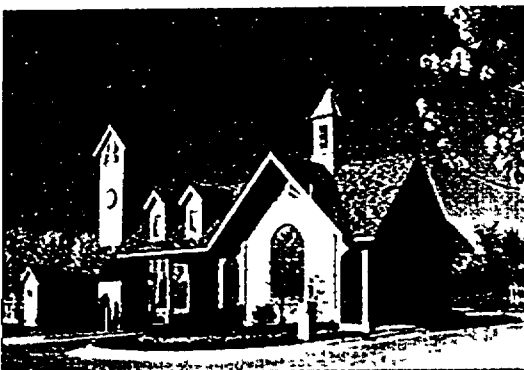

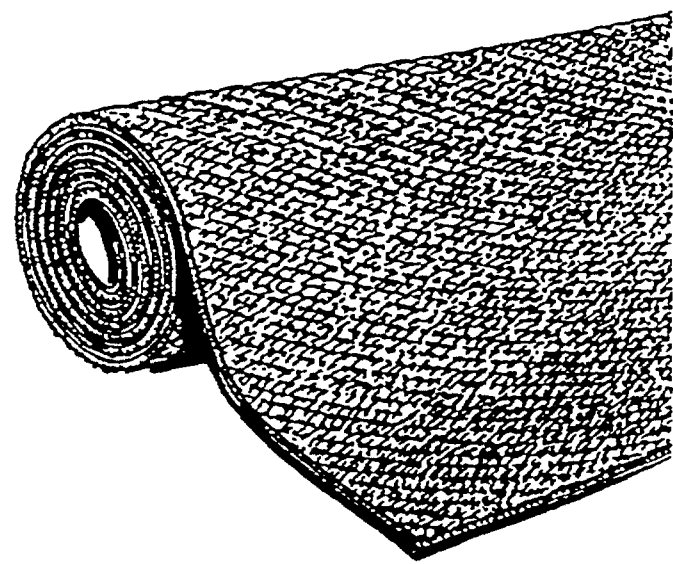

Have your retailer or installer make final measurements to ensure accuracy for the order.

- **Cost**-Buy the best grade of carpet you can afford. A better grade of carpet will give you a greater length of service than one of lesser quality and will be more economical over time.

- **Color**-New stain and soil resistant technology makes today's lighter colored carpet much easier to clean, allowing more decorating options. Medium and darker colors, tweeds, prints, and textures will help disguise dirt in high-traffic areas.
