# Street study could follow millage OK

Northville city officials are calling for a detailed study of downtown streets, should voters approve 1.92 dedicated street improvement mills next March.

The study would be paid for out of proceeds from the election, and won't take place until - and unless - voters have approved the ballot proposal. The election is scheduled for March 4.

The Northville City Council identified the city-wide traffic study as part of the proposed street improvement program earlier this month. According to a report prepared by Public Works Director

Jim Gallogly the study will look at all aspects of improving city streets.

"The study will be performed by a qualified traffic engineer whose goal would be to analyze Northville's street system, identify current and future congestion and safety problems," he said. "The study will also assess street alignment and pavement modifications in an effort to divert unwanted traffic around Northville without hurting businesses."

Gallogly added that the study would also provide recommendations as to appropriate street

# Nearby ice arena possible this year

One of the top stories in neighboring Novi in 1996 was the rumor raised when the city and a West Bloomfield developer worked on a plan for an ice arena and community sports club on the Meyer Berry Farm at Eight Mile Road.

Expect it all to come back again in 1997, except this time the target location is Ten Mile and Novi Road and the negotiations are not likely to be controversial.

For the ice arena, the city is haggling over land near the south-east corner of Ten Mile and Novi Road. City Manager Ed Kriewall said last week

of The Sports Club of West Bloomfield, confirmed that he is working on a purchase agreement with Dan Weiss, the owner of Weiss Construction Co., for vacant land along Ten Mile.

"It's exciting for our business and I would think it would be exciting for the community," Healey said.

"I think it's a good location. It can serve a wide market, Novi and neighboring communities as well. You end up serving thousands of customers over the year."

The Sports Club is seeking 10 of the 80 acres held by Weiss for a 130,000 square foot sports facility. The city is looking at buying 15 of

# City businesses report brisk sales

Santa Claus came early and often to most downtown Northville merchants this year.

That's the preliminary indication from business operators, who say this year's holiday buying season was prosperous despite being one week shorter than usual.

Final retail figures won't be available until January, but according to most merchants downtown Northville attracted plenty of holiday shoppers this year.

"When we look at the day-by-day results, we ended up in the double digit range in sales percentage," said Lou LaChance, owner and operator of Ultimate Toys on Center Street. "I'm extremely happy with the results, but I would have liked another five shopping days."

LaChance, like many downtown merchants, went into the holiday buying season with a plan geared towards increasing sales.

"We worked the plan pretty well and the results were a bit better than we expected," he said. "Overall, we're quite happy with how we did over the shortened holiday period."

Debbie McDonald, Chamber of Commerce president and operator of Northville Diamond Jewelers, said that traffic in the downtown was steadier, and consequently, busier.

"From what I've seen the coordinated efforts by merchants was

a plus and contributed to this year's holiday success," she said. "I believe that a stronger chamber of commerce with more businesses becoming members probably had something to do with increased business in the downtown as well."

The local chamber of commerce has benefited from a 40 percent growth in membership this year.

The popular jewelry store enjoyed a strong holiday buying season for the second straight year, according to McDonald, who explained that promotions and increased advertising opportuni-

# Cable rates to nudge upward starting next month

## Basic to increase by about 5%

Northville city and township Continental Cablevision customers will be experiencing a slight increase in their basic cable rates early next year.

According to Continental spokesman Bill Black, basic cable rates will increase from \$21.59 to \$22.95 per month beginning Feb. 1 - an increase of \$1.36 or about 5 percent.

"The rate increase takes into effect program cost as well as the newly added channels," Black said. "It also takes into effect the rate of inflation and other administrative costs that we are allowed, by law, to pass along to our cus-

tomers."

Black said that customers will be receiving a notice of the rate increase sometime before the middle of January.

He said cable rates are usually increased at the beginning of each year.

"We've added more than a dozen cable networks over the course of this year, and I'm confident that our customers will understand this small increase," he said.

Continental currently offers services in the five consortium communities of Northville, Northville Township, Plymouth, Plymouth Township, and Canton.

The company purchased the Omnicom of Michigan cable sys-

tem in January of last year, and recently merged with US West, a utility provider.

The company has spent the past year retrofitting its cable system in Northville to provide customers with a new two-way fiber optic telecommunications network.

That system will bring customers a clearer, more reliable picture, and will provide more than 100 channels, according to Black.

Black also explained that the system will offer customers a glimpse into the future of telecommunications by providing a link to the Internet.

Close to 50 cable customers are currently testing the new Internet link, which should be available to Northville subscribers within the next 90 days.

The primary advantage of Conti-

nal's new service is that it will allow customers to access the Internet hundreds of times faster than anything available today, Black explained.

## City asks for help in keeping walkways clear

With winter snows blanketing the area early this year, Northville city officials are reminding residents and business owners to remember to keep their sidewalks free of snow and ice.

City Building Inspector Rick Starling has already sent out notices alerting the community that the city's snow and ice

removal ordinance is in effect and will be strictly enforced.

"The ordinance basically states that snow and ice must be removed from the sidewalks within 24 hours of snowfall or an ice storm," Starling said. "We're asking the community to help in keeping our city safe from slip-and-fall accidents due to snow and ice on sidewalks."

According to the ordinance, if

snow or ice is not removed within the time limit, city public works crew will take action to remove it and the resident or business will incur the cost of the removal, as well as any costs related to notification, enforcement and administrative costs.

Any person neglecting or refusing to comply with the ordinance could end up in court and face fines of up to \$100 for each

offense.

"We are hoping that the community will comply. We don't want to spend our time ticketing people for not shoveling their walks, but everyone needs to understand that we will aggressively enforce the ordinance," Starling explained.

## Tree disposal made easy in city, township

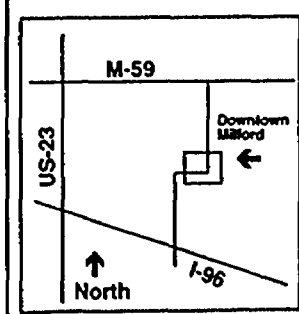

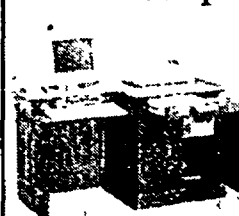

# Uncooperative suspect allegedly threatens police

"You're in trouble, mister."

Such was a Livonia man's alleged comment to police as he was driven away in handcuffs after being arrested on charges of drunk driving last week.

The man, 36, was taken into custody at about 2:15 a.m. on Dec. 22. A Northville Township officer driving east on Seven Mile Road said he followed the man's 1994 Ford Ranger pickup. The Ranger crossed left of the center yellow road line several times, according to police, and was doing 57 miles an hour in the 45 mile an hour zone.

When stopped, the man allegedly displayed signs of intoxication and denied any wrongdoing in a "mocking and sarcastic" tone of voice. He failed field sobriety tests, however, and was taken to police headquarters, according to the officer.

While in the back of the squad car the man allegedly spoke at

length of his family's importance in the area and told the officer that he (the officer) was "in trouble" and demanded that his attorney be called.

It was he who was in trouble, however, after testing at police headquarters allegedly showed the man's blood alcohol level to be .15 percent. That's well above the legal limit of .10 percent.

He was held until he sobered up, then was released on bond pending a court appearance.

**HIT AND RUN:** Northville police are searching for a man who fled the scene of an accident Dec. 26.

According to police the man was apparently driving east on Eight Mile Road when, unable to stop for the red light at Sheldon, he struck a car driven by a 48 year-old Northville woman.

The woman told police that when she suggested they both pull their cars over to the side of the

road and alert police the man fled.

The suspect was driving a blue van, and police were able to obtain paint samples from the damaged vehicle. If you have any information pertaining to the accident contact detective Dave Fendeleit at 349-1234.

**BASKETBALL TRESPASSERS:** A 45-year-old Northville man should have known better when he and his 12-year-old son entered the closed Northville High School to shoot some hoops.

The man was cited for trespassing Dec. 27, when officers investigating an open door at the high school caught the man and his son playing basketball in the gym. School officials were notified and requested that charges be brought against the man, who told officers that people are often in the gym shooting baskets when the school is closed.

The boy was not cited.

**STOLEN ATV:** Someone ripped off an ATV and snowmobile trailer from a Rollingwoods Circle man's driveway during the night of Dec. 20-21.

The man, 37, said the items were worth a total of about \$6,100. They were listed as stolen in the area law enforcement computer network.

**BROKEN WINDOWS:** A Rayburn Road man's car windows were smashed during the early morning hours of Dec. 21.

The man, 53, told police that the incident must have happened between about midnight and 8 a.m. The windshield and rear window of his 1996 Ford Escort were broken with a croquet mallet. A side window was smashed with a rock.

The damage is set at \$750.

**SHOPLIFTING:** A Detroit woman shopping at Meijer with

her children two days before Christmas was arrested for shoplifting.

Store detectives said they saw the woman, 35, put a number of items into her cart and into a baby stroller, then leave the store without paying for them. Their total value was about \$280.

A computer check revealed an outstanding felony warrant for the woman's arrest from the Southfield police. She was wanted for failing to appear in court to answer charges of probation violation.

The woman was held at police headquarters until Southfield police picked her up. The kids were turned over to a relative at the store.

**DRUNK DRIVING:** A 41-year-old Northville woman was arrested for drunk driving Dec. 29.

According to police the woman made an illegal right turn at the

intersection of Novi Road and Eight Mile, and was observed driving erratically. A Northville police officer stopped the woman after she turned onto Rayson Street.

The officer noticed a smell of intoxicants coming from the vehicle and requested the woman perform some field sobriety tasks. The woman then was given a preliminary breath test that registered .22 percent blood alcohol content.

She was transported to the Northville police station and officers were unable to get a reading on a second blood test. Police then obtained a search warrant for blood, which was drawn at Providence Hospital in Novi.

The woman was held on \$500 bond.

## Gains in auto industry help lower jobless rate statewide

Unemployment rates dropped in six of Michigan's 10 major labor market areas in November, according to seasonally unadjusted data compiled by the Michigan Employment Security Agency (MESA).

"In most cases, the changes in area jobless rates from October to November were minor," Tom Malek, acting MESA director, reported. "Only two areas - Flint and the Upper Peninsula - had rate fluctuations of greater than

half a percentage point."

Unemployment rates declined in the Flint, Jackson, Benton Harbor, Detroit, Grand Rapids/Muskegon/Holland, and Lansing areas.

The Flint area had the largest decline as its rate fell from 5.9 percent in October to 5.3 percent in November. Malek attributed the decline to employment growth in the area's retail trade and automotive industries.

Four areas reported rate increases in November. The areas were the Upper Peninsula, Ann Arbor, Kalamazoo/Battle Creek and Saginaw/Bay/Midland.

The greatest increase occurred in the U.P., where the rate jumped by nearly 2 percentage points, from 5.6 percent in October to 7.4

percent in November.

"A sharp drop in U.P. employment caused the jobless rate to increase," Malek explained. "Seasonal job losses in the region's construction, transportation, retail and service industries led to the rate increase."

In all areas except the U.P.,

employment levels climbed in November. Retail trade had significant gains as retailers hired workers for the holiday shopping season. Local government also had some employment increases as some schools added staff and as workers were hired for the November general election.

Most major industries, however, suffered job losses. The greatest declines occurred in construction and services.

Losses in both sectors were seasonal. Manufacturing employment also dropped because of production adjustment layoffs in the auto industry.

# Metropark admission rates to remain unchanged in '97

## Launching fees also steady

Vehicle admission charges at area Metroparks will remain unchanged in 1997: \$15 regular for the season, \$8 for seniors (62 or older), \$3 on weekends and holidays, \$2 on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays, free on Wednesdays.

Boat launching fees also will be unchanged: \$18 regular for the season, \$9 for seniors, \$4 on weekends and holidays, \$3 on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays, free on Wednesdays.

Corporate discounts of 20 percent are available for purchasing 50 or more. Passes for 1997 went on sale Dec. 1.

Most popular of the 13 parks, judging from anticipated operating revenue, are Kensington, \$2.2 million; Metro Beach, \$1.7 million; and Lake Erie, \$1.5 million.

They are followed by the three small parks northeast of Ann Arbor - Dexter, Delhi and Hudson Mills, at \$950,000; Willow and Oakwoods, on the lower Huron River, \$932,500; Stony Creek, \$930,000.

Huron Meadows, with its golf course, will bring in \$864,000, fol-

lowed by Indian Springs at \$816,000; Lower Huron, \$328,000; and Wolcott Mill in northern Macomb County, \$68,100.

A new director will take over Jan. 11 when William P. Sherman retires after 40 years with the system. Frank L. Sudek was promoted from deputy director.

### BUDGET, JOBS FLAT

Wahl said the 1997 operating budget will be almost identical to 1996's. Some \$21.2 million, about half the general fund budget, will come from a property tax rate of 0.2236 mills. Voters approved 0.25 mills in 1940, but it has been pared down by the state tax limitation amendment.

Property tax revenues will be up 5 percent - 2.8 percent due to inflation in assessments, 2.2 percent due to new construction, much of it in Livingston County.

Vehicle admissions and other operating revenues produce about one-fourth of all operating funds: \$10.3 million, up 3.5 percent.

Wahl said admission estimates

are affected by weather and, in the case of Metro Beach, by 1994's pollution spills.

"Metro Beach should experience a 5 percent (\$70,000) growth in revenue as we move further away from 1994," he said. Lake Erie golf revenues grew at a solid 8 percent, but pool revenues there declined 6 percent in 1996.

Not shown in the general fund budget are about \$2 million from oil and gas royalties from Kensington Metropark. Segregated into a separate budget, they will be used for supplemental major maintenance items, notably Metro Beach's water system.

Employment will remain virtually flat: 187 full-time and 743 part-time or seasonal workers. Major operating cost hikes will be an expected 10 percent rate increase in health care and 12 percent more for pensions, Wahl said.

HCMA covers the five counties of Wayne, Oakland, Livingston, Washtenaw and Macomb. Each county sends one board representative, and the governor appoints two members.

improvement measures needed to mitigate the impacts of major development without altering Northville's small town charm and atmosphere.

"(The study) is not expected to significantly alter street design," Gallogly said. "The two major arterials in the central business district - Main and Center streets - can not be widened because of the limited right of way, parallel park-

ing demands, and buildings constructed up to the right-of-way line."

City officials are busy gathering Wayne and Oakland county traffic projections which will be used by the traffic consultant.

The study will cost city taxpayers close to \$50,000, and will be paid for out of the first year dedicated millage if voters approve the measure.

If the proposition is defeated, the city will not conduct the study.

Gallogly said that developing a request for proposals for the study and awarding the contract will take about three months and the consultant would not begin working on the project until April. Gallogly estimates the study will take about six to eight weeks to complete.

"Clearly a traffic study is appropriate and warranted. However, it is not a prerequisite to the proposed street program," he said. The 1.92 mills would be a reded-

ication of a former street improvement bond - representing 1.98 mills - that is scheduled to be retired by the city this year.

The new millage will fund street improvement and replacement, along with sidewalk improvements and water drainage improvements, over the next 20 years.

The dedicated millage will generate about \$440,000 per year, according to city officials.

the acres, which are zoned for light-industrial uses.

"That might work out pretty good," Kriewall said.

With the Community Clubs of Novi, a top priority for 1997 is to get the two-rink, public/private arena development up and running, Kriewall added.

Healey said he doesn't expect his business will be operating until 1998. When he was considering the Eight Mile Road site, Healey said it was crucial that the business attract a Northville, as well as a Novi, clientele.

"The problem with the Eight Mile

site was we were in a recreational area. This parcel is zoned light industrial."

"I think it will overcome the objections raised with the Eight Mile parcel," Healey said.

The Novi site will likely be similar to the West Bloomfield operation, where a gymnastics program is being added to the sports lineup. Offerings include martial arts, tennis, racquetball and fitness programs.

The club offers three pools: an eight-lane, 25-meter pool, a smaller pool with a depth ranging from 1.5 feet to 3.5 feet and a water park for kids with a small slide and water sprays.

"It's not just a place for an exclusive membership. For us to be successful, we have to get a lot of people in the community into our facility," Healey explained.

In West Bloomfield, The Sports Club and the township's Community Education program offer a class for moms and tots.

During summer 1996, residents of both south Novi and Northville turned out to protest a new recreational zoning proposal that would have permitted the sports club to be constructed at the Meyer Berry Farm.

A top concern was the influx of the traffic and noise of a commercial operation into a relatively

rural area long planned for residential.

Another worry was the domino theory, that the Sports Club would lead to other businesses locating along Eight Mile.

One of opponents to the southern Novi site was Chuck Young. This time around, Young said he has no problems with the Sports Club and ice arena construction along Ten Mile.

"I think that's a good location. How can the residents fight it on the potential location? I think it might be an advantage to the city," Young said.

"It's centrally-located for the City of Novi."

## Community ed programs possible at nearby facility

If the Sports Club of West Bloomfield opens a Novi branch at Ten Mile Road, the goal will be to appeal to as many people as possible with a variety of membership opportunities, owner Glenn Healey said.

Healey said the goal was not just to offer an exclusive club, but to lure other users through daily rates and possible community education programs.

As a member interested in just the tennis program, expect an initiation fee of \$100 and a monthly fee ranging from \$20 for seniors and individuals to \$43 for families.

A fitness membership, which includes access to tennis courts and programs at member rates -

plus free racquetball - comes with an initiation fee of \$300 for one year or \$100 per year for three years. Monthly fitness rates range from \$75 per month for individuals to \$140 for families and include lap privileges at the pool.

Also available are summer swim club memberships, which bear an initiation cost of \$250 and summer memberships running from \$200 for an individual to \$400 for a family with one child and an additional \$50 per child. Fitness and tennis members can get discounts off the summer swim club rates.

While the adults are working out, children can be dropped off at the Kid's Center for \$2.10 per hour for one child to \$4.20 per hour for four youngsters.

## Utility warns of phone scam

Consumers Power Co. is alerting customers that individuals claiming to represent the utility are conducting telephone solicitations in various cities in Michigan's Lower Peninsula, allegedly seeking market research information.

In some phone contacts, people are asked for their Social Security numbers.

Customers with questions about a phone contact by someone claiming to represent Consumers Power should call the utility's toll-free number, 1-800-477-5050.

"Consumers Power does periodically

conduct telephone surveys of its customers," said Teri Boertman, customer research supervisor in marketing programs and research for the utility.

"The difference between Consumers Power's surveys and the recent phony inquiries is that the caller has asked for the customer's Social Security number, something we do not do in conducting market research," Boertman added. "We urge customers with concerns or questions about a phone inquiry related to Consumers Power to contact us."

Participants should respond to Diann DuPuis at 348-1845. Monday through Friday from 9 a.m.-1 p.m. The meeting will feature a presentation of the 1996 Volunteer Recognition awards, and a short presentation about the Northville Community Archives housed in Cady Inn.

Membership renewal notices have been mailed with the winter 1996 Mill Race Quarterly. If you have not received your copy contact the office to renew now. The spring Quarterly will be sent only to those who have currently paid their dues.

More on the early history of this region.

When the settlers arrived in this area Michigan was still a territory. Even though Wayne County existed, the area hadn't been fully divided into townships.

The financial affairs of the county were managed by three county commissioners. In 1842 the responsibilities of these commissioners were transferred to a board of supervisors. When first appointed supervisors were paid \$1 per session for the eight sessions they attended yearly. That salary was later raised to \$3 per session.

In 1827 Wayne County was composed of the townships of Detroit, Springwells, Hamtramck, Monguagon, Brownstown, Plymouth, Ecorse, Huron and Bucklin. In 1829, Bucklin became Nankin and Pekin. Pekin later became Redford with Dearborn created as a part of it. Much later Nankin became Westland.

Hamtramck was named for Colonel John F. Hamtramck, who was the first United States commander of Detroit. Monguagon or Maguagon was the name of a Potawatami chief and Brownstown was named for Adam Brown, an Englishman captured as a youth by the Wyandotte Indians who later became one of the most important chief of that tribe.

Nankin and Pekin were selected as names because they were not used elsewhere in the county. The name Detroit had of course been selected more than a century earlier by the French.

It is believed the name Plymouth selected by the first area settlers was to honor the first settlers at Plymouth Rock. At the time of the names' selection in 1827 the township comprised today's Northville, Plymouth and Canton. Canton separated and got its name in 1834.

North of the Baseline Road (Eight Mile) lay Oakland County. At the time this region first developed all of the northern half of the county was known as Oakland Township. Bloomfield Township held today's Bloomfield Hills, West Bloomfield, Royal Oak, Troy, Southfield, Farmington, Novi, Commerce, Millford and Lyon.

At that time Oakland County had civil and judicial jurisdiction over a vast territory occupied in more recent times by Lapeer, Sanilac, Tuscola, Huron, Genesee, Saginaw and Shiawassee counties.

In 1827 Oakland was divided into five townships: Bloomfield, Oakland, Pontiac, Troy and Farmington. In at least the first few years of the areas settlement fur trading continued to be the major occupation for those who entered the Michigan territory.

By the late 1820s and 1830s those arriving in the area came "not to prospect for gold or to speculate in lands or railroad, stocks or bonds, but to make a home. To fell the mighty forests, not to make merchandise of the timber, but to clear it out of their way that they might cultivate the soil to procure food for themselves and those dependent on them"

## CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF NORTHVILLE AMENDMENT TO THE ZONING ORDINANCE, ORDINANCE 94, SECTION 18.37 ADD TEMPORARY USES, EVENTS, BUILDING AND STRUCTURE

Section 18.37 - Temporary Uses, Events, Building and Structure - The new standards outline the submittal requirements and standards/procedures for review of the temporary use request. In any nonresidential district, upon issuance of a permit, temporary uses, temporary sales of retail goods and seasonal/special events may be allowed. Once the required information has been submitted, the request is reviewed by either the Zoning Board of Appeals or the building Official, as identified in the Ordinance.

A copy of the entire ordinance can be inspected or obtained at the Township offices by contacting The Township Clerk. This ordinance was adopted on December 12, 1996 by the Board of Trustees and is effective with this publication.

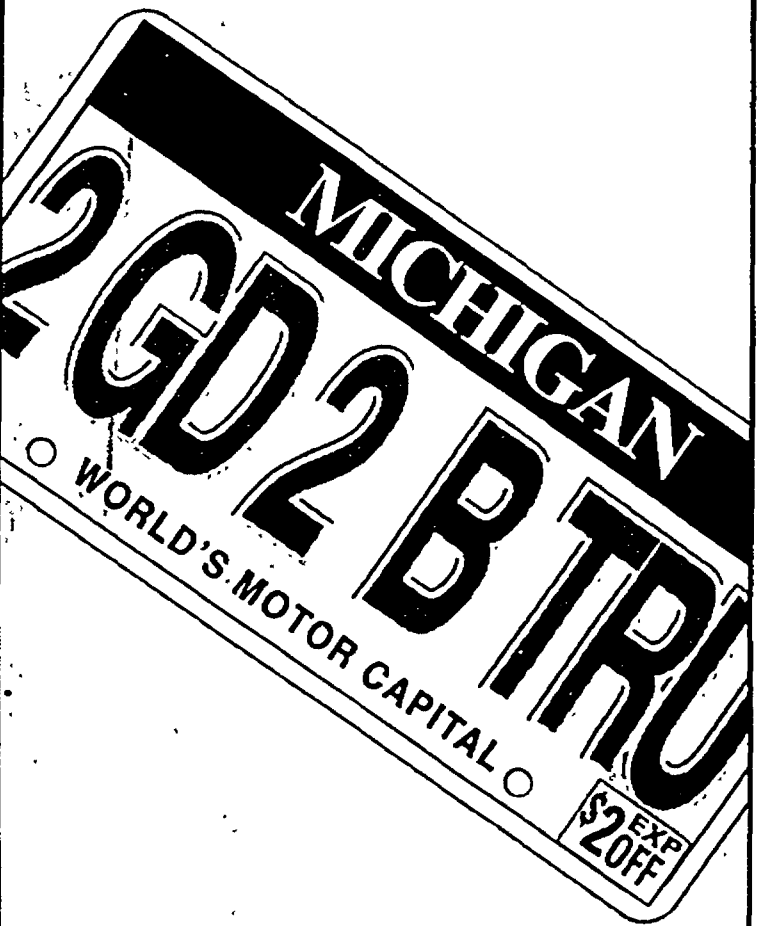

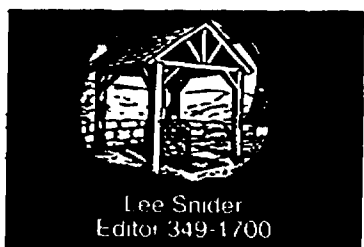

### Downtown continues demonstrating viability

How good a secret is downtown Northville?

So good, even some of its business operators don't know about it. Fortunately, though, they seem to be catching on.

A quick, unscientific sampling of opinion from key Northville central business district merchants indicates that the recent shopping season was a good one for many downtown businesses.

Though a late Thanksgiving pared a few irreplaceable days off the total number of shopping opportunities, the bottom line was apparently a happy one for people making their living in Northville.

If our poll is representative, downtown business owners can thank their good fortune on (besides their own hard work) the stepped up efforts of the Northville Central Business Association and the Chamber of Commerce.

This year, the CBA and the Chamber took a more proactive role in promoting the downtown, expanding the Christmas parade and prompting the participation of more merchants.

Business owners who contributed to a fund that was used for seasonal decorations and other expenses displayed an identifying logo in their windows.

The end result, evidently, was a prosperous commercial season for downtown businesses.

What we see coming about - finally - is a realization that downtown Northville is a great place to shop, all the hype about the convenience of malls and superstores notwithstanding.

True, a lot of people are in a hurry nowadays and like to get everything

done as quickly as possible, but just as many others are still taking time to stroll through a small downtown that looks like the kind of place you'd want to be at Christmas.

Just ask our neighbors in Novi about the attraction and allure of the Main Street concept. Novi has malls and shopping complexes enough to make your head spin, yet even as we speak developers are working on retrofitting the glitzy city with its own small town-type business district. If that doesn't speak volumes about the viability of alternative commercial venues we don't know what does.

Main Street Northville may have changed from the kind of basic-service place it once was, but a city can change and still remain vital.

The overall economic success of the community is inevitably tied to the energies and marketing skills of its business operators.

What is needed more than ever, we think, is a sense of cooperation on the part of the central district merchants. The good news is that the trend is in that direction.

### Boasting about tax cuts leads to short-sightedness

Catching up on what has (and has not) happened in the last year:

**ROADS:** For a decade, Oakland County's state freeways and county roads have been deteriorating. Our Leaders in Lansing just aren't embarrassed by it. They would rather boast about "21 tax cuts" than about "21 worst road problems fixed." In the lame-duck session, the Legislature juggled a few million out of the Secretary of State's office for road and bridge work, but it was a fraction of what is needed.

So local cities like Northville, Novi, Plymouth and Brighton have given up waiting and are voting their own bond issues and taxes to take care of city streets. Lazy Lansing has succeeded in shoving the problem onto the locals. It's a bad solution, but locally voted taxes may be the only way around the state's political quaking at the "T" word.

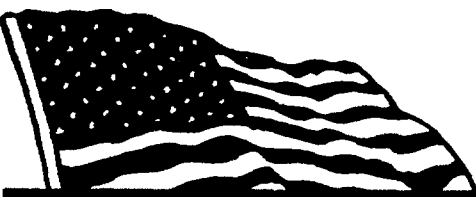
**ARTS:** The Senate passed one bill to allow southeastern Michigan to vote taxes to support the arts, but it expired in the House. The House passed its bill, but it died in the Senate.

Maybe it's just as well. The truculent Detroit City Council is adamant that it won't surrender an inch of political control over the Detroit Institute of Arts. Ditto with the Detroit Zoo. Both institutions are heavily supported by the state but controlled politically by one city, which has a residency requirement for working there.

Suburbanites, for their part, will be unwilling to pump tri-county money into a department of one city's government. This year, state arts funding continued to shrink; the jewels don't sparkle. We have to expect that. Clearly the region needs to find not only a funding mechanism for the arts but a governance system, too.

A great opportunity lies ahead for the Big Four - Oakland Executive L. Brooks Patterson, Wayne Executive Ed McNamara, Detroit Mayor Dennis Archer and whoever emerges from the Macomb County brawl.

**MORE ARTS:** Oakland Community College, with a reputation for technical and college preparatory education, also



### GOVERNMENT

is making important contributions to ceramics, pottery, painting, music and the performing arts. Unfortunately, too few people know about it, despite the advent of cable television with dedicated channels. Hint, hint.

**COURTS:** Oakland's influence rises as voters elevated appeals Judge Marilyn Kelly to the state Supreme Court and the governor promoted Circuit Judge Hilda Gage to the Court of Appeals.

Meanwhile, big things will be going on as the circuit and probate courts share more powers; we're inching toward a single "trial court" system. Moreover, the legal cognoscenti, prodded by Oakland's Tom Klenbaum of State Bar fame, are probing "merit" selection of judges - a potentially vast improvement over blindly picking "name" candidates at the polls.

**URBAN SPRAWL:** Michigan's population continues to hover around the 9.4 million mark, but we are following a czarist "scorched earth" policy in paving over hills, woodlands, lakeshores and farms for development. The three new state laws allowing communities to buy "development rights" from farmers are unlikely to be used. Working folks are more likely to be staring at tailpipes in traffic jams, for which Oakland is becoming (in)famous, than at the oak trees that used to be our trademark.

**SCHOOLS:** The push is still on by those who favor the implementation of a "voucher" system. Oakland's public schools will fight back Feb. 2 with a celebration of their progress at Summit Place Mall on Telegraph Road in Pontiac. Last year's exposition in the intermediate school district's Waterford office was packed, and local schools were well represented.

## Churches had rapid emergence

What began with missionaries, circuit riders and religious meetings held in Northville-area barns, gradually grew to include several permanent places of worship in the town.

Northville's earliest church, the First Presbyterian, was organized in 1829, just four years after the town's first settlers arrived.

In 1831, on land donated by early pioneer Daniel Cady, construction for a small wooden church building began. In 1838, the church became involved in a theological split within the Detroit Presbytery. Two rival

factions were created: the Old School was the conservative side; the New School was the liberal branch. When land was donated by a conservative member to build a church, the fate of that branch was settled.

However, there were enough New School members in the area to organize a second Presbyterian Church in Northville. The church this second group constructed in 1845 was called the New School Presbyterian Church. After only four years, however, New School members decided to return to the original church.

The former New School Church building did not remain vacant for long. During the next 100 years, it served the community in a number of capacities, most notably as the Northville Public Library. The building currently stands as part of Mill Race Historical Village.

Meanwhile, the Old School members had updated their own small church building with a new brick structure in 1845. The present structure on Main and Church streets dates from the 1870s.

The second church to organize in Northville came

about when a Baptist minister arrived in 1833. Four years later, the congregation had raised enough funds to build a permanent church. Remodeled in 1858, the church, located on Wing and Randolph streets, went through extensive remodeling and updating in the 1950s through 1970s.

When they began in the 1830s, Methodist Church services were held in neighboring homes and barns before a permanent structure could be built in 1836. The small frame building sufficed until a new church was erected in 1885 on Center Street and Dunlap. It is now owned by the Gifford and Raven Gallery.

The end of the 19th century saw the formation of yet another Protestant church in Northville. St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church was formed in 1896. Originally located at Nine Mile and Taft roads, the small frame building doubled as a school, with the religious services held in German.

Only one year later, the cornerstone for a permanent church was laid and a separate schoolhouse was built at its present location on Elm near High Street. The original building was given a face-lift in 1930, but was replaced 19 years later by the present brick structure.

Though visiting priests came to Northville as early as the 1880s, a permanent home for Roman Catholic worship was not built until the early 20th century.

On the land where today's Our Lady of Victory Catholic Church stands at Orchard and Thayer streets, a frame building was constructed in 1922. This served the Catholic community for over 30 years, until it was torn down to make room for the current building.

The school began in 1952 with only four rooms. The church and the school have grown to become among the largest of Northville's religious organizations.

# Geake: '96 was year of achievement

"Protecting your family's future" was the message Sen. Robert Geake, R-Northville, and Loren Bennett, R-Canton Township, delivered last month as they recapped the 1996 legislative year, illustrating how new laws are intended to benefit families in southeast Michigan.

Here is a statement submitted by Geake's office containing the senator's summary of the year's goals and achievements.

Each legislative initiative undertaken last year was aimed at improving the quality of life for all Michigan residents. The results can be seen and felt in each community.

Creating jobs and a stable economy has not only reduced unemployment to its lowest level ever recorded, but has improved the quality of life across the state. People are more independent, self-sufficient and rely less upon government for support. Jobs are the cornerstone upon which individuals are building stronger families, greater independence and creating opportunities for themselves.

By providing tax incentives to businesses locating and expanding in Michigan, our state has become more competitive with neighboring states, succeeding in an enhanced ability to keep existing jobs in Michigan and lure new jobs to the state.

To include the state's most economically disadvantaged areas in this rebirth, the Legislature has prepared guidelines for the implementation of Renaissance Zones. The eight areas to be selected will initially be tax-free to businesses and residents, creating incentives for revitalization. These zones differ from "empowerment zones" by mixing business and residential growth, creating entire communities. State taxes, except for the sales tax, will be waived for 11 years and then graduated to the normal level by year 15.

Among other significant legislation that became law this year was Michigan's welfare reform plan, which provides for such individualized needs as transportation and child care to assist welfare families in obtaining and keeping jobs. Michigan's Friend of the Court system also received an overhaul that provides greater assurances of support for children. The Legislature provided for more equitable custody agreements that promote family cooperation and created stronger penalties for evasion of child support.

Reform of child support collection, child custody and Friend of the Court procedures have been major accomplishments this year. However, more needs to be done.

The Legislature's creation of competition among public schools has resulted in increased choices for parents and better educational opportunities for our children. An "apprenticeship program" has been created within the private sector, providing tax credits to participating businesses which teach young people the high technology skills necessary to compete in today's global economy.

With increasing job opportunities and education improvements under way, the Legislature's attentions turned to health care, senior citizens and safety concerns.

A focus was placed upon ensuring that physicians inform patients of all their treatment options, emphasizing pain management, and increased hospice care for terminally ill patients. With Michigan's aging population, this is more important than ever.

Senior citizens also benefited by one of Michigan's largest tax cuts - the pension parity plan - which allows retired seniors to use more of their capital gains for their retirement needs. This provides seniors with greater financial independence, allowing them to keep their homes and afford more of their own health care. All citizens will enjoy a greater personal tax exemption this year.

We took major steps toward making Michigan communities safer for all people by enacting strong anti-crime legislation, including a focus on juvenile justice issues to help stem the tide against gang- and drug-related problems. We concentrated on truth-in-sentencing legislation that ensured young criminals served time appropriate to the crimes committed - eliminating the coddling of serious juvenile offenders.

New reporting requirements for juvenile detention facility escapes were enacted, as well as a plan to offer boot camps as a viable sentencing option for juvenile offenders. This year's legislation also paved the way for the creation of Michigan's first "punk prison."

We implemented a sex offender registry, whereby each person convicted of a sexual offense must register with the state. To date, there are 20,384 names in the registry. In this way, law enforcement can monitor the

activities of dangerous individuals.

As an important adjunct to the sex offender registry, we also enacted legislation allowing citizens to obtain information regarding individuals in the registry who might reside in our communities.

Citizens can now better defend themselves and their families against dangers presented by potential recidivists.

We passed legislation preventing sex offenders from having their records expunged after serving their time. We did this because sex offenders have an extremely high recidivism rate and must not be allowed to conceal their past offenses. Along the same lines, legislation was passed to allow criminal history checks into the backgrounds of job applicants vying for positions involving the care and custody of children.

In the interest of public safety, we doubled the fine for those caught speeding in school zones, established that drunken drivers who orphan children may be ordered to pay child support, and created a provision in the penal code to allow the courts to try arsonists for murder if anyone dies in the fires they set.

Not forgetting the environment in which all of our lives revolve, we have made great strides in cleaning up Michigan's many toxic sites, bringing new life to abandoned industrial areas, enlisting the aid of the private sector in keeping our air, land and water clean, and preserving our farmland and open spaces for future generations to enjoy in good health.

These were the 1996 objectives that were put in place to achieve the goal of protecting your family's future.

## Cable rates enough to drive you to read

If you read a stack of community newspapers, such as this company's, one issue stands out nearly everywhere. **Although there are several cable television companies, most articulate folks hate the local cable firm, and for the same reasons.**

Once they get the franchise, cable TV companies hike rates faster than inflation. And while people in different towns deal with different cable companies, we tend to cuss them out in the same language.

The thought occurred as I paid my own January cable bill. The notice said the cable company "has adjusted some of its monthly service rates."

"Adjusted," my eye. The total bill is up 10 percent. The regulatory fee paid to the Federal Communications Commission is down 20 percent, from 5 cents a month to 4 cents, but the big ticket items are mostly up.

"Standard cable service" is up 12.1 percent to \$16.12. Combined broadcast basic and standard service is up 10.3 percent to \$26.42. And the addressable converter fee is up 18.9 percent to \$2.08. Some "adjustment."

The cable company added insult to injury by enclosing a customer survey. Here are

some of the significant questions: "Have you ever spoken with one of our customer service representatives. If so, how would you rate the customer service representatives when you've called or visited our office?"

"Have you ever had a technician come to your home for a service call? If yes, how would you rate our repair service? How do you rate our billing service?"

The survey is a phony, of course, and designed by the company to make itself look good. It offers a prize, which taints the process. And it fails to ask the real questions that people discuss. Here's what an honest cable TV survey would ask:

- We are raising our basic service rate 10 percent. Did you get a 10 percent pay raise this year?
- We are eliminating CICO, the Canadian public channel with its arts and drama programs, and substituting a home shopping channel. Do you approve?
- What do you think of the way we promote high-price programs such as boxing matches or first-run movies on a pay-per-view basis?
- What do you think of the increasing number of one-star and two-star movies shown on such premium channels? Do you suspect the networks are deliberately reducing their quality to prompt you to buy "pay-per-view" programming?

The cable company's alibi is that "costs" are up. What they hide is the fact that costs have two components - price per unit and the number of units (customers).

For example, suppose the price per unit is \$1 and the company has 10,000 customers.

Its total cost is \$10,000, right?

Now suppose the unit price drops to 90 cents, but the number of customers rises to 12,000 as more homes are wired in. The total cost now is \$10,800, which represents an increase, even though the price per unit has dropped.

Do you see the little mathematical trick the cable company plays?

Moreover, in this example, the cable company's total costs have risen, but so has its revenue, even if its fees stay the same. It serves 20 percent more homes. It switches from a commercial-free educational channel to one where it can sell sponsors, so ad revenue increases.

In short, the alibi of a "cost" increase doesn't begin to justify a fee increase that's more than triple the rate of inflation.

Your impulse will be to call your local franchise authority, in either city hall or township hall. Will that do any good? Doubtful, because as I said at the outset, the handful of cable companies operate pretty much the same way.

They blather about "competition" when they bid for a franchise, but once the contract is awarded, each has a monopoly and makes the most of it.

What to do about it? I'm not certain, but I have this conservation book that I got for Christmas called "A Sand County Almanac." Maybe we all should read more. The price of a library card still is zero.

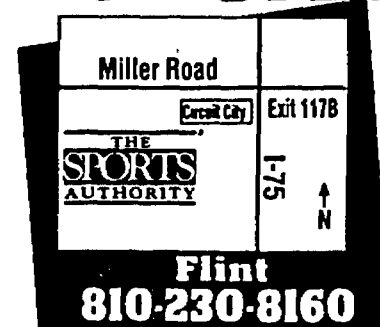

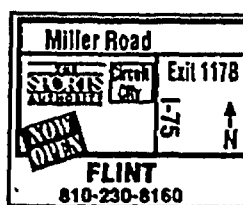
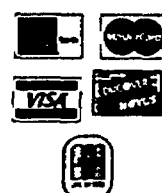

## Clift places students with volunteer jobs

Many non-profit organizations would be in quite a pinch were it not for Barbara Clift.

Although not a volunteer herself, Clift is hoping to place about a hundred Novi High School students in volunteer positions throughout the community.

This school year, 107 students have shown an interest in volunteering. Seventy-six of them have returned signed application forms and have been given assignments in the community.

"I think that is really impressive, that so many kids want to help out," said Clift, whose many roles at the high school include volunteer service coordinator.

There are three motivating factors, according to Clift.

The National Honor Society requires the completion of 40 volunteer hours to be accepted. Once a student is in he or she has to do 25 hours per year.

Students who might be on the verge of failing a class are also pro-

vided with an incentive. If they put in 100 hours per school year they may earn one-half credit hour in social studies.

The third common reason is an interest in helping or in wanting to try out a career.

For example, an athletic trainer from the Total Rehabilitation and Athletic Conditioning Center (T.R.A.C.C.), a department of Botsford Hospital, needed help and was willing to train someone. He came to Clift to put out the call for students interested in physical therapy or sports medicine as a career. He now has two volunteers.

"It was a nice way to get them matched up," Clift said.

Whatever the motivating factor, volunteering is a way to get them going and potentially working in volunteer capacities for the rest of their lives, according to Clift.

"They get in the habit of lending a hand," she said. "It builds their self confidence and self esteem."

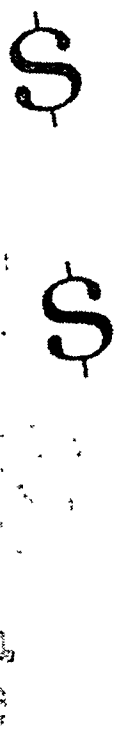

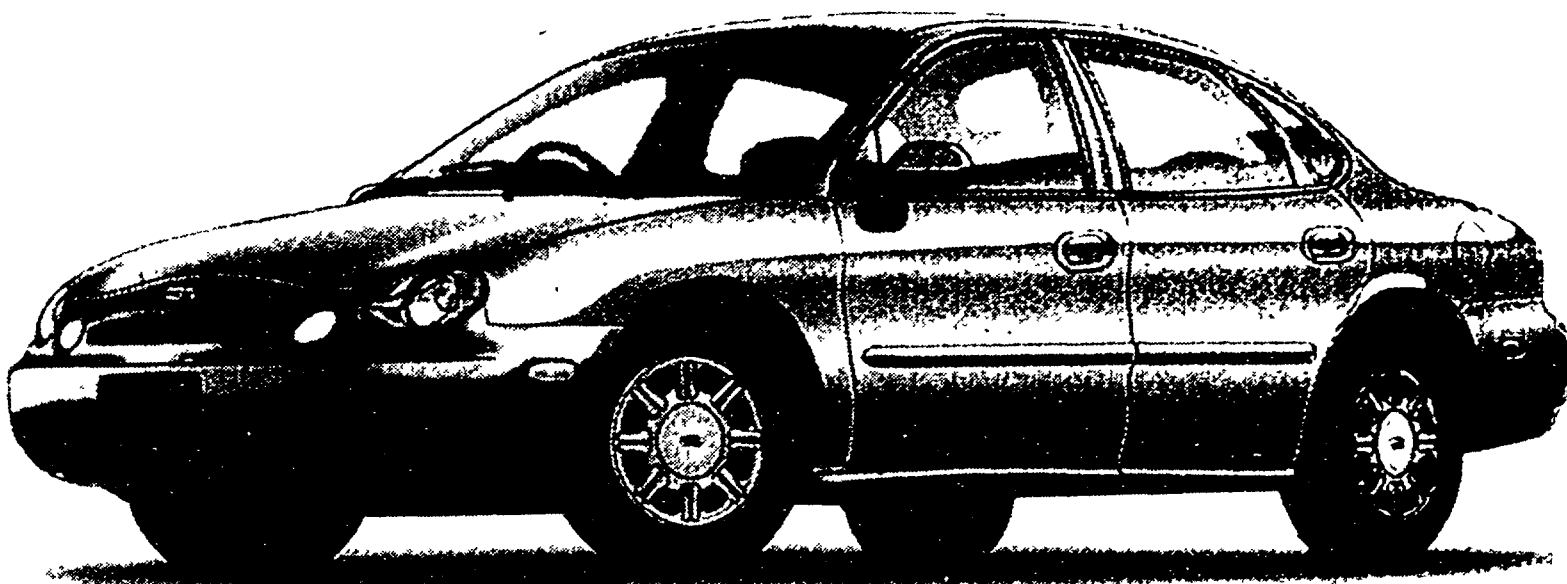

years ago by Ron Wixom, who retired in October 1995. This is Clift's first school year matching students and volunteer positions.

"There are a lot of positive outcomes for a program like this," she said. "Since I have done co-op for a number of years I'm familiar with matching students with jobs, so it has been a natural transition for me," she added.

Student volunteers work in areas like Botsford Hospital, Wixom State Park, T.R.A.C.C., Living Science Foundation in Wixom (for

students interested in working with animals), Meadowbrook Veterinary Clinic, Novi Middle School (as tutors for the middle school children), Novi Public Library, Whitehall Convalescent Home, churches, tutoring in the English as a Second Language program, Novi Motorsports Hall of Fame (from washing cars to helping out with different events), and Novi Parks and Recreation.

"If they want to be a teacher, they can try out tutoring or working in the day care," she said.

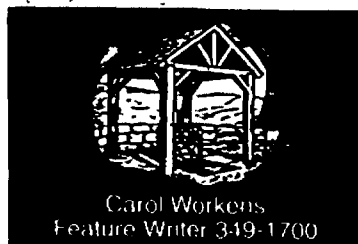

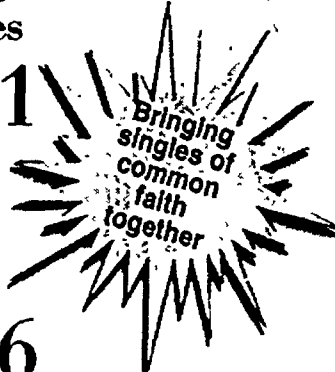

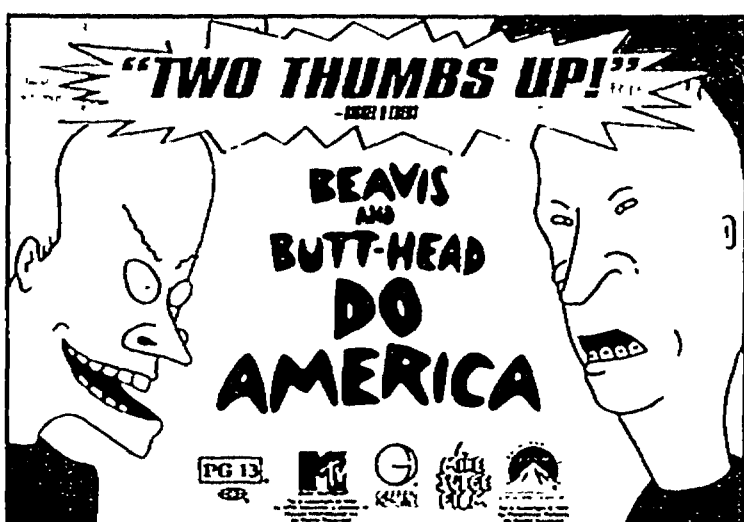

## Craven film is a real 'Scream'

From the first name in suspense comes the last word in fear — "Scream."

Audiences have come to expect no less than a thrilling, terrifying ride from Wes Craven. Now, the creator of such chilling films as "A Nightmare on Elm Street" and "The Serpent and the Rainbow" is moving into a new genre — a thriller.

With "Scream," Craven and screenwriter Kevin Williamson have ambitiously crafted their own personal valentine to suspense, taking the classic elements of the genre they know inside and out and reinventing them with new substance and a clever, smart, sophisticated spin.

Sidney (Neve Campbell of "The Craft" and TV's "Party of Five") has more than her share of teenage angst to cope with. Her mom was murdered a year ago, her dad is perpetually away on business, and her boyfriend Billy (Skeet Ulrich, "The Craft") is pressuring her to go all the way.

As if that weren't enough, a brilliant serial killer has begun to ter-

rorize Sidney's quiet hometown, including her high school classmate Casey Becker (Drew Barrymore). With the calculated genius of a perfect predator, the killer is using his love of scary movies to turn the town upside down — taking everything he knows about the genre to trick his victims, outwit the police and throw his pursuers off base. Now, no one is safe — and everyone is a suspect.

Sidney's best friend Tatum (Rose McGowan, "The Doom Generation"), Tatum's boyfriend Stu (Matthew Lillard, "Hackers") and class clown Randy (Jamie Kennedy, "Romeo and Juliet") see the mayhem as just another excuse to party and rent scary movies. But Sidney is further disturbed by the arrival of relentless TV tabloid reporter Gale Weathers (Courteney Cox), who cashed in on her mother's murder by writing a tell-all book.

The local deputy, Tatum's naive older brother Dewey (David Arquette, "Beautiful Girls") sets out to investigate the crimes, but can't help being a little distracted

by the alluring Weathers. It'll be up to Sidney to stop the killer from killing again. Solving this mystery is going to be murder.

"I make movies about fear," director Wes Craven says. "But 'Scream' confirms my long-standing belief that thrillers can also be great character pieces that can get deep under the skin of human psychology. Scary movies have such a strange elegance to them, because they confront our very real, primal fears. 'Scream' works on that level, but also examines the questions of loyalty and perception of truth. That makes 'Scream' a scary movie, but a scary movie of real substance and ambition."

The odyssey of "Scream" began long ago in the young mind of its writer, Kevin Williamson.

"I can remember seeing 'Halloween' over and over again when I was ten years old," Williamson recalls. "It scared the living hell out of me. When I saw Wes Craven's 'Nightmare on Elm Street,' I was so scared my leg got a cramp, and I couldn't leave the

theater until the movie ended."

Williamson's love for such classic genre films as "When a Stranger Calls," "Prom Night" and "Terror Train" continued into adulthood, when he decided to set his love for the genre down on paper — the beginnings of the script for "Scream."

Using all he had learned, Williamson set about crafting his own vision — a thriller populated by clever, intelligent characters that would stand as his own smart, original take on the suspense genre.

Once the completed script was circulated around, the writer's enthusiasm spread to just about every studio in Hollywood. Most of the major studios went after the script with relish; movie heavyweights from Oliver Stone to Sharon Stone entered into the "Scream" derby. Dimension Films and director Craven ultimately walked away with the prize.

"The script was hot," says Craven. "It was just one of those scripts that you read and say, 'My God! This is really shocking!'"

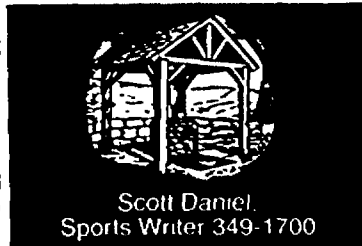

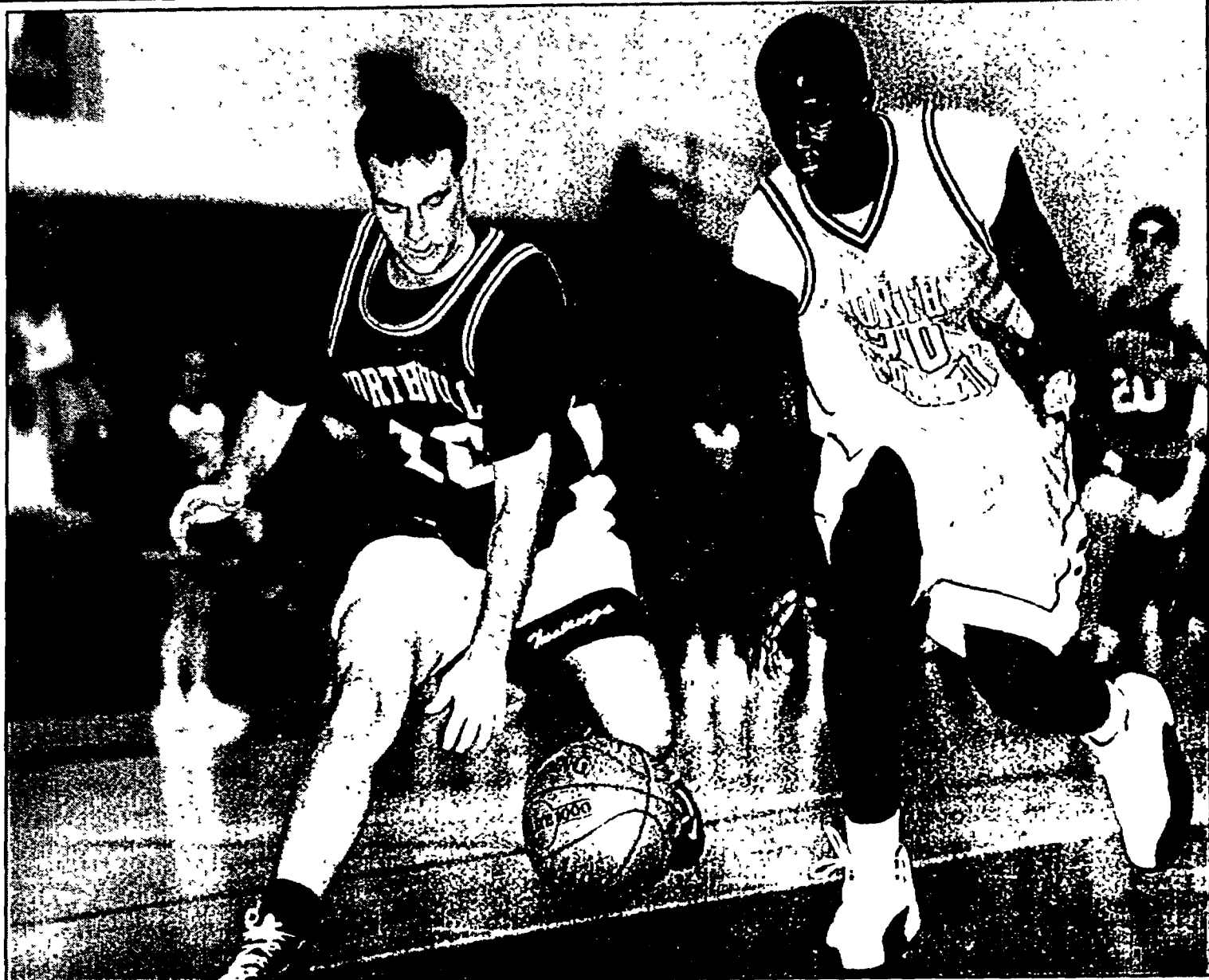

Both are in their third year with the Mustangs. Williamson and Manza both shine on the balance beam.

#### SPRING

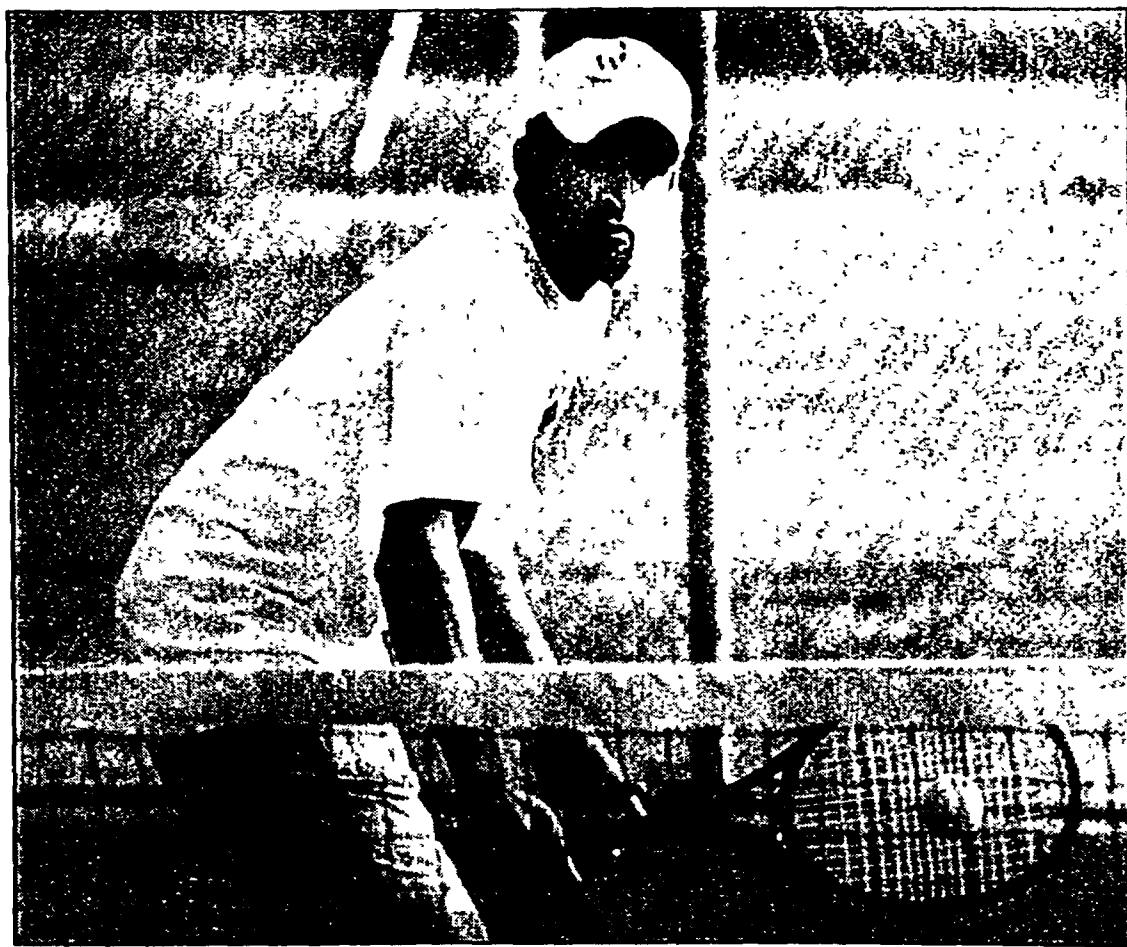
##### Boys' track

## Diet, exercise key to healthy life

We are living in an extraordinary age. Medical technology makes it possible to live longer than ever before.

In 1900, only 4 percent of the population lived to be 65. Now 12 percent of the population is over 65 and the numbers continue to grow. People over 85 now comprise the fastest growing segment. Amazingly, two-thirds of all the people who ever lived past the age of 65 are alive today.

Eubie Blake, the great black songwriter who lived to be more than 100 said, "If I had known I was going to be so old, I would have taken better care of myself." While a funny quote, it is something to consider. If we have the opportunity for longevity, we should do everything we can to realize it.

There are tragedies in life that cannot be prevented or helped but it is perhaps a greater tragedy to suffer or die from something that is self-inflicted or that could be prevented.

Here's what you can do to maximize your chances for a long and healthy life:

**Diet:** Diet plays a great role in our health. Obesity, high-cholesterol and low-fiber diets are associated with diabetes, heart disease and the development of colon cancer. Know your cholesterol levels, control your weight and eat a healthy diet.

**Exercise:** Physical activity is important for health. Exercise increases endurance and helps control weight and cholesterol and it could help you feel better so you can more fully utilize your time and abilities. In cases of arthritis or disability, it can make the difference between being completely crippled or being functional. With illness or advanced age it is always wise to ask a physician for advice before undertaking an exercise program.

**Cancer:** Many cancers are treat-

able and curable if detected early. Colon cancer may be detected through a chemical test for blood in the stool. It's an inexpensive, easy test to do at home and mail back to the physician. The American Cancer Society recommends that everyone over 50 have a flexible sigmoidoscopy to screen for colon cancer. They suggest this be done two years in a row and then repeated every three to five years.

Sun exposure is a leading factor in premature aging of the skin and development of skin cancer. Cautious sun exposure, using sun screens and seeing a physician for worrisome moles or spots on the skin can help prevent problems.

Men should routinely do a self-examination of their testicles to check for lumps or abnormalities. Older men should have a rectal exam and PSA blood test to check for prostate cancer. Prostate checkups should begin at age 40 for African Americans and those with a family history of prostate cancer. Others can begin at age 50.

Women should do a monthly breast self-examination and have a mammogram done as indicated by their age and family history.

Women who are sexually active or over age 18 should have annual Pap smear.

**Quit Smoking:** Smoking is one of the worst things you can do for your health. It predisposes you to lung, throat, tongue and other cancers. It causes and aggravates many breathing problems and leads to circulatory and heart disease. Although it is difficult to stop, all smokers should quit.

**Vaccinations:** Many major causes of death in the past can now be prevented by vaccination. Measles, mumps, polio, tetanus, rabies, influenza and certain types of hepatitis and pneumonia are vaccine preventable illnesses. The decision for vaccination should be made by your doctor since age, profession, health status and foreign travel may modify which vaccination are appropriate.

**Prenatal Care:** Pregnancy can have complications. Pregnant women should see their physician early so that problems for the baby or the mother can be prevented.

**Hobbies:** Hobbies and interests add spice to life and make living worthwhile. All physicians see patients whose problems are

caused or made worse by emotional or personal factors. Cultivating interests may promote greater physical and mental health.

**Buckle up:** Wearing seat belts saves lives and is appropriate for almost everyone. Use special protective car seats for infants and young children.

**AIDS:** AIDS is a concern to everyone. The virus is more prevalent than most people think and cuts across all classes and types of people. Practicing safe sex is important.

Everyone is different and there is no set formula to ensure health for everyone. Heredity, accidents and uncontrollable factors have a profound effect on our lives. By having frequent checkups, following your physician's advice and taking responsibility for your life, you will be able to realize the newfound longevity that is becoming more apparent.

### Real estate, mortgage brokers are prospering

Real estate brokers are not the only people happy about the recent rise in home sales. Mortgage brokers also are prospering.

The currently low mortgage interest rates, improving economy and rising home prices are motivating more people to take action on their home-ownership dreams. The situation generally prevails throughout the nation.

Total mortgage-lending nationwide is projected to reach \$452 billion by the end of the year, according to Experian, a real estate research and information company. That figure would reflect an increase of 23 percent more than last year's volume.

"The increase in loan production is partially due to a pickup in housing demand across the country," said Nina Nattagh, Experian's market analyst. Nonpurchase originations are projected to increase by 35 percent by the end of the year to reach \$215 billion. That would account for nearly 50 percent of all loan originations, compared to 45 percent in 1995.

Total purchase mortgage originations is projected at \$236 billion for 1996, a 13.5 percent increase from last year.

Regionally, the report portrays a diverse picture of lending activity, with New York, Florida and California underperforming other

states.

At the same time, Rhode Island, Oregon, Maryland and Arizona are showing above-average growth in total loan originations.

In California, the nation's largest mortgage market, the economy is gaining momentum and lenders are gradually recovering much of the ground lost to the economic recession of the early 1990s, the Experian report noted.

Total originations in California this year is projected to reach \$64 billion, about 19 percent above 1995.

But California ranks last in terms of growth in refinancing and equity mortgage lending, indicating a shrinking pool of homeowners in the state who stand to benefit from refinancing, as well as the presence of a significant number without equity in their homes.

The hottest home-buying markets in the nation are Portland, Ore., and Phoenix, the report said.

**Q. You reported a pending deal involving the National Association of Realtors and an outside contractor that could result in enhanced marketing capabilities of brokers. Was that deal ever finalized?**

**A. Yes.** The change involved an agreement providing for outside management of the National Association of Realtors' Internet site -

The master suite also opens onto the deck. This has also been designed to be a den for studying or working at home.

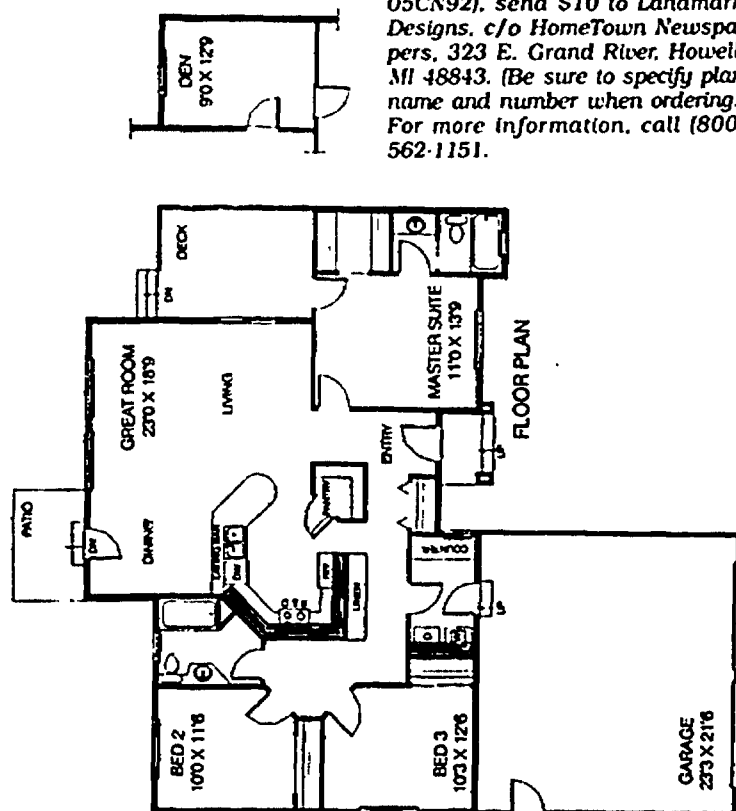

## Making large spaces feel cozier

**Q. The master bedroom in our new house is much larger than our old one and our furniture seems lost. Eventually we'll be able to accumulate enough furniture to fill it, but any money left over from buying the house has to go for essentials (like adding a bath on the third floor for the children). Meanwhile, what can we do to make our bedroom feel warmer and cozier? My husband thinks we should spring for wall-to-wall carpeting, at least.**

**A. I'm inclined to agree.** Although wall-to-wall will make the space look even larger, especially if you choose a light color, it will also make it look more furnished to the eye and feel cozier underfoot.

Several other suggestions have been inspired by the photo we show here of a bedroom designed by Anne Tarasoff. It was actually done for a designer show house, but Tarasoff's sleights-of-hand could work magic in your case, too.

A canopy bed is a beautiful space-filler. Hers looks antique, but you could create the same effect by hanging curtains directly on the ceiling, gathering them at the corners with wide ribbons or

cord tiebacks.

Area rug laid on top the wall-to-wall carpet. You might use more than one - under a seating area, say, or on both sides of the bed.

Dramatic draperies. They needn't be made of expensive fabrics (try sheets to match your bed), but be lavish with yardage and hang them at ceiling height for maximum effect.

Indulge in a bit of whimsy. Tarasoff had an artist paint a trompe l'oeil vine twining subtly across the ceiling in the corners of the room. And if you look closely, you'll see that the secretary by the window is an eye fooler painted on the wall to fill a temporarily empty spot.

Here's my chance to repeat a favorite mantra: Decorating is an ongoing occupation. Never think of any room as "finished." Oh, you may reach a stopping point from time to time, but a room should always ebb and flow, evolve and change as you and your needs do.

And that's a lifelong process.

**Q. My dining room measures 12 by 12 feet, and my ceiling is 10 feet high. The chandelier that I want is 24 inches wide and 13 inches high. It is a flush mount and takes eight 60-watt**

candle bulbs. My question is, will this chandelier provide enough light? If not, what wattage do I need and how do I determine how large a chandelier I need?

**A. Multiplying 8 x 60 watts, I come up with nearly 500 watts, which should be more than enough ambient or "walking around" lighting. In a dining room, however, that could also mean a lot of glare. Lighting experts suggest that the bulbs in a chandelier should give no more than 25 watts each and be well shaded at that.**

You might be better off to supplement a center-ceiling fixture with other, more romantic sources of light, say, a pair of wall sconces and/or small lamps on the buffet or bookcase. About sizing up your chandelier in the first place: The only safe way is to eye-ball it in place. Most stores will let you "try on" fixtures. Take it home and have someone hold it in place while you study the proportions. A chandelier shouldn't look lost against an ocean of ceiling, nor should it hover ominously in the space.

## Poinsettias are not poisonous

Each Christmas season, millions of Americans purchase poinsettias for their homes and offices.

In fact, according to the United States Department of Agriculture, between 40 million and 50 million plants are sold each year, making the poinsettia the No. 1 potted plant grown in our country.

Although these plants sell well, especially during the holiday season, many people believe the age-old myth that the poinsettia plant is poisonous.

According to The Society of American Florists, a national trade association, stories falsely accusing poinsettias of being poisonous have been circulating around the country since 1919. These stories have not been confirmed by anyone in the medical or scientific field.

To alleviate the public's fear concerning the poinsettia's alleged toxicity, the society, in collaboration with Ohio State University, conducted extensive research on the plant.

Test results indicate that ingesting the plant will not cause death or serious injury to people or pets. Results showed that although digesting a poinsettia leaf may cause stomach irritation or

discomfort, the plant is not poisonous. Milk or ice cream can usually ease the discomfort.

Consumers should keep poinsettias and all other nonedible houseplants out of the reach of children and pets.

Ironically, even though the test results confirm that the poinsettia is safe, the majority of Americans still think it is poisonous. The society conducted a poll asking 1,000 Americans if they thought poinsettias were toxic. The survey showed that 53 percent of respondents still believe poinsettias are toxic if eaten. 35 percent were not sure and only 12 percent of the respondents believed that the plant was not toxic.

## POINSETTIA CARE

Poinsettias, if cared for properly during the holidays, can prosper all year.

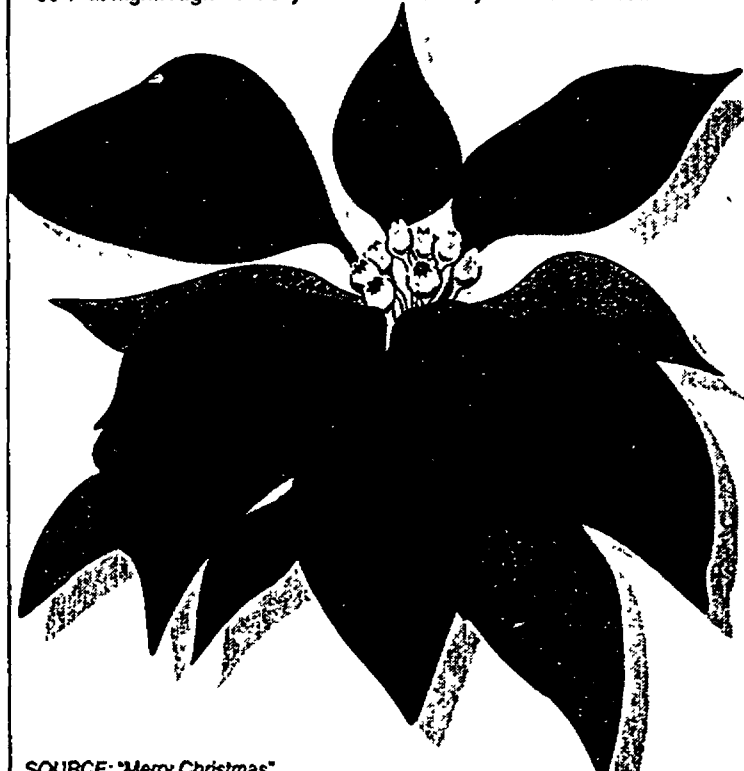
During the holiday season, when selecting a poinsettia, choose tightly clustered, small, central flowers with crisp and bright foliage.

When the surface soil feels dry, water thoroughly. Discard excess water in the saucer.

## Poinsettia facts and pointers

- Pick plants with tightly clustered, small central flowers with crisp bright foliage.
- When potting soil begins to feel dry, water thoroughly. Do not let water stand.
- To prolong blooming, keep temperature 72°F in the day and 60°F at night. High humidity is

- best, so avoid setting plant near furnace registers or cold drafts.
- Poinsettias are not poisonous, though ingesting their leaves may cause stomach discomfort. Eat ice cream or milk to alleviate the pain.
- The plants were first imported into the United States from Mexico in 1820 by Dr. Joel Poinsett.

"With the quantity of ads increasing steadily, plus the quality of real estate information enriching the site, Realtor.com has enormous potential," said Russ Booth, association president.

Consumers and real estate professionals are finally being brought together through the use of technology, the association report stated. The Web site will be designed to help consumers find the early information they need to get acquainted, or reacquainted, with all aspects of the real estate transaction. It will serve to educate consumers.

**Q. What are the chances of getting a break soon on real estate capital gains taxes?**

A. Capital gains tax relief is in sight, according to a couple of key lawmakers - U.S. Sen. Don Nickles, R-Okla., and U.S. Rep. Bob Matsui, D-Calif.

Favorable capital gains tax treatment, in some form, is likely to be enacted in the next congressional session. Despite partisan differences, they agreed that America's voters have sent a message to Congress that the time is right for tax relief for home owners and, in some cases, for business and investment.

"The elections were good news for real estate, for business and for home owners," Nickles said. "The fact that Republicans kept control of the House and Senate means we have a good shot at sending a tax package to the White House that includes a broad capital gains tax reduction - not just one targeted at families - as well as incentives for saving and investment."

## Poinsettia facts and tips for care

Continued from 1

To prolong color, keep a temperature between 60 in the evening and 72 during the day. High humidity is preferable.

Avoid cold drafts.

To rebloom for the next season.

Follow above tips during winter.

When leaves fade, cut back to 8 inches.

Lightly fertilize every three to four weeks.

Place plant outdoors when warm; first in indirect, then in direct light. Avoid temperatures below 50 degrees.

Cut back stems and branches twice during the summer. Repot if needed.

On Labor Day, move plant inside. Provide six or more hours of direct light.

From the first day of autumn (Sept. 21) to Thanksgiving, confine the plant to darkness for 14 hours (example: in a closet or under a box), giving it 10 hours of natural light each day. Continue to water and fertilize. Rotate the plant each day to give all sides even light. This will force the green leaves to color.

On Thanksgiving, discontinue short day/long night treatment. Place the plant in a sunny area with at least six hours of direct

sunlight. Reduce water and fertilizer.

If you follow the above directions, you should have a healthy, colorful poinsettia plant to enjoy during the holiday season.

**Q. I can't seem to keep whiteflies from destroying lily poinsettias. I've used a number of products but the pests thrive and the plant drops its leaves. What to do?**

A. Whiteflies can be lethal on most poinsettias, but to make matters worse, poinsettias are sensitive to many insecticides. Control whiteflies on poinsettias by applying an organic insecticide twice a week for at least three weeks until the infestation is under control.

Hopefully, this will control these pests, but if it doesn't, alternate applications of soap (Ivory) and water (use a sponge) to wipe the leaves on both sides carefully. This should do it!
