Volunteer legions line up to work on playscape

We can build it if you come. That's the message Northville playscape volunteers are delivering to the community this week, less than six days before the construction of Fort Griswold begins on June 4.

"The success of this project depends entirely on the community's support," said Karren Yurgalite, public relations coordinator for the playscape project. "More than 1,500 volunteers are needed during the five days to hammer boards, paint, help serve food, and

a multitude of other tasks."

Construction of Fort Griswold is scheduled for June 4-8.

Yurgalite explained that volunteers are still needed and that playscape committee members are working hard to contact as many people as possible. "But if you're interested and have not been contacted please pick up the phone and call Sue Egan to confirm you are coming."

A wide variety of tasks will be offered. Enlisting volunteers for skilled and unskilled construction is the group's main concern, according to Egan, but non-construction jobs like childcare, food service, runners, tool personnel, and first aid are needed as well.

The five day work schedule shapes up like this:

• June 4 - First shift 8 a.m. to noon; second shift, 12:30 to 5 p.m.; third shift, 5:30 p.m. to dusk. Major work will be pole setting and requires 125 strong people per shift.

• June 5/6 - First shift 8 a.m. to noon; second shift, 12:30 to 5 p.m.; third shift, 5:30 p.m. to dusk. Major work will be framing the structure and requires 150 people per shift.

• June 7/8 - First shift, 8 a.m. to noon; second shift 12:30 to 5 p.m.; third shift, 5:30 p.m. to dusk. Major work will be finishing the structure and requires 200 people per shift.

Yurgalite said no one under 10 will be allowed on the work site. Children ages 10-13 may work alongside a parent. Teens 14-17

DDA to levy millage on properties in district

With the blessing of some downtown merchants the Northville Downtown Development Authority will be levying an operational two-mill tax within the DDA area.

The DDA's north-south boundaries are one block north of Dunlap Street and one block south of Cady. The east-west boundaries are Wing Street and Griswold.

The Northville City Council last week approved the authorization to levy the tax, which will generate close to \$35,000 in the next fiscal year. The tax will be levied on property owners of buildings inside the development authority boundaries.

Although the council vote was unanimous, several council members expressed concern about the levy, according to City Manager Gary Word.

"There was some reluctance among some members of the council because the DDA hasn't determined what the funds generated by the levy will be used for," Word said. "Now it's up to the DDA to rededicate its efforts in deciding the best and most responsible way to utilize the funding."

Despite that uncertainty, officers of the Northville Central Business Association endorsed the levy in a letter to the DDA last month.

Toward the classrooms of tomorrow?

Are computers vital to program in local schools?

Fully integrating computer technology into the classroom has been a goal of school district officials for close to a decade.

In 1989 voters were asked to approve the purchase of new computers and a fiber optic infrastructure to serve as the backbone of the district's technology system. The new technology, school officials claimed at the time, would play an integral role in preparing students for careers in the 21st century.

Voters overwhelmingly approved the measure, the equipment arrived, and students began spending time in computer labs preparing themselves for a technology-driven society.

Now, eight years and several generations of computers later, the school district is asking voters to spend \$5.2 million of a \$61.5 million bond request on technology purchases.

The issue goes before voters June 9 and, according to Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski, it's

time for the district to bring computers into the classroom.

"We need to prepare our students for an increasingly competitive world where businesses use technology to increase productivity, improve communications, and develop worker independence," he said. "We are ready to take the next step in our technology plan to benefit students."

Approval of the bond measure will bring state-of-the-art computer technology into all eight local schools. It will also provide new software and allow existing technology to be upgraded.

Under state law, none of the bond proceeds can be used for additional personnel, and without the option of an "enhancement" millage the district will be paying the salaries of the new technical personnel from its general operating budget.

Last year was the last opportunity for school districts to ask for an enhancement millage, but Northville voters defeated that proposal (1.95 mills for one year) along with the bond request last September.

The board of education recently approved hiring one computer technician and an administrative/clerical worker for the district's technology department.

Prosecutor examines pro-bond literature

When the Northville Public Schools bond and millage ballot proposals failed last September many people in the community blamed the superintendent and his administration for not doing a better job of getting out the vote.

"We weren't as proactive as we could have been," Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski said. "That message came out loud and clear in the recent survey, and this time we decided to become more aggressive in getting the information out to voters."

So in the last few weeks before the district's second try at the \$61.5 million proposal, Rezmierski has sent three separate letters to taxpayers outlining the issue. Letters have also been sent by school principals alerting voters to the June 9 ballot initiative.

But in the process of informing the local electorate the district may have violated a state statute that prohibits school districts from using tax dollars to actively campaign for a ballot issue, according to Northville resident Bob Bernard.

The Wayne County Prosecutor's Office is investigating a complaint

filed by Bernard last week, and according to Assistant Wayne County Prosecutor Frank Bernacki the district has until today to respond to several questions regarding the possible violation.

"School officials received a communication from our office last week regarding the complaint filed by Bernard," Bernacki said Tuesday. "We're giving them a chance to respond to our questions and then we'll evaluate whether a violation did occur."

Bernard's complaint claims that district officials improperly used tax dollars to campaign for approval of the upcoming bond election in the form of letters, post

Township population tops 20,000, census shows

Head count means more funds from state

Bardon Kruman Associates, the firm conducting the mid-decade census for Northville Township, said on Friday that the township's census goal has unofficially been met.

Of 7,889 housing units visited by census counters, 18,846 people were identified. Census regulations stipulate that a municipality can only receive census credit for 50 percent of the people living in public facilities such as Northville Regional Psychiatric Hospital and the Scott Correctional facility. Based on that formula, an additional 1,357 people were included in the count, bringing the population total to 20,203. As of early this week, only 58 housing units were still outstanding.

The purpose of the mid-decade census was to update the 1990 federal census, which reported a population of 17,313 in Northville

Township. The advantage of conducting a census is to receive additional funds through the Michigan State shared revenue program, which distributes revenues raised through the state sales tax to local communities based on population.

An increase of at least 15 percent in population is required for a municipality to qualify for new resources. It is estimated that about \$300,000 in additional revenue will be received annually by Northville Township through the finding of at least a 15 percent increase in population.

The census results must be submitted to the State Elections Division for certification and will not be official until that process is complete.

Bardon Kruman expects to submit the census report to the state on Monday, June 2.

CROP Walk funds distributed to local charities

Two local agencies received \$1,000 each from money raised last year by the Northville/Novi CROP Walk.

The Novi Emergency Food Fund and Northville Civic Concern were awarded the funds April 29 at a celebration dinner for the CROP Walk held at the Meadowbrook Congregational Church.

Pastor Richard Henderson of Faith Community Church said the CROP Walk money will provide substantial help for the Novi program, as it is supported only by donations from the churches and individuals.

"We provide supplemental food

for low income people in Novi," Henderson said.

He said that every other Monday morning a group of Novi volunteers meets at the Faith Community Church to organize and distribute non-perishable items to an average of 20 to 30 families. There are approximately 45 families on the list.

"In the winter when the heating bills go up we see more people," Henderson said.

"A lot of that need is hidden in the community. You tend to see big homes and demonstrations of affluence, but there are pockets of

poverty here," Henderson explained.

He added that elderly and young couples with children are typical users of the program.

An acronym for the Church Rural Overseas Program, a national interdenominational organization for food programs, the local walk raises money each year that is collected nationally and distributed to various food shelters. CROP Walk 1996 raised \$20,000, according to Pastor Chuck Jacobs of United Methodist Church in Novi.

He said 70 percent of all money

raised goes to the regional Lansing office where it is distributed worldwide.

The CROP Walk originated in Michigan and Oct. 5, 1997, marks the 10th anniversary of the Northville/Novi walk.

"It's kind of a celebration for us," Jacobs said.

In addition, the Bronze Shoes were awarded to Meadowbrook Congregational Church for a 152 percent increase in fund-raising during the April celebration.

The Bronze Shoes award is a local tradition between the 12 Novi and Northville churches that participate and goes to the church with the largest percentage increase in fund-raising from one year to the next.

Students perform errands at homes

This time of year most high school students are busy making plans for the summer months ahead.

For about 70 Northville High School students those plans will include lending a helping hand to someone in the community.

A new project, created by the high school Student Congress, will make its debut Saturday when dozens of students converge on the home of longtime Northville resident Jenny Watson, armed with paint brushes, weed whackers, and other assorted tools.

The project, titled "Paint the Town," was developed by incoming high school senior class President Joshua Brugeman, and is geared toward keeping students involved in their community.

"This project represents an ongoing effort to bring students and the community together," Brugeman explained. "It gives us a chance to get out into the community and have a positive effect."

The students are working with senior citizen coordinator Karl Peters of the Northville Senior Center on the project. Watson is a member of the center whose home needed a bit of "sprucing up."

"We expect to get quite a bit accomplished," Brugeman said. "Especially if there is a good turnout."

The list of jobs includes power washing the homes' exteriors, painting inside and outside, landscaping, replanting flowers, and other general house work.

Brugeman said he expects 75 to 100 students to show up during the day. "It's important that we get the word out that anyone wanting to help or donate materials should contact the high school," he said.

According to high school Assistant Principal Dennis Colligan, the students efforts should be lauded.

"They are really a great group of kids, and they have done a lot of planning for this project," he said.

The work is scheduled to begin at 8 a.m. and continue until dusk. For more information contact Colligan at 344-8425.

For Brugeman the project is the first of many.

"It's an important year for us. We need to establish ourselves so that the community efforts will continue," he concluded. "We want to help people and stay involved in our community."

"That's what this program is all about."

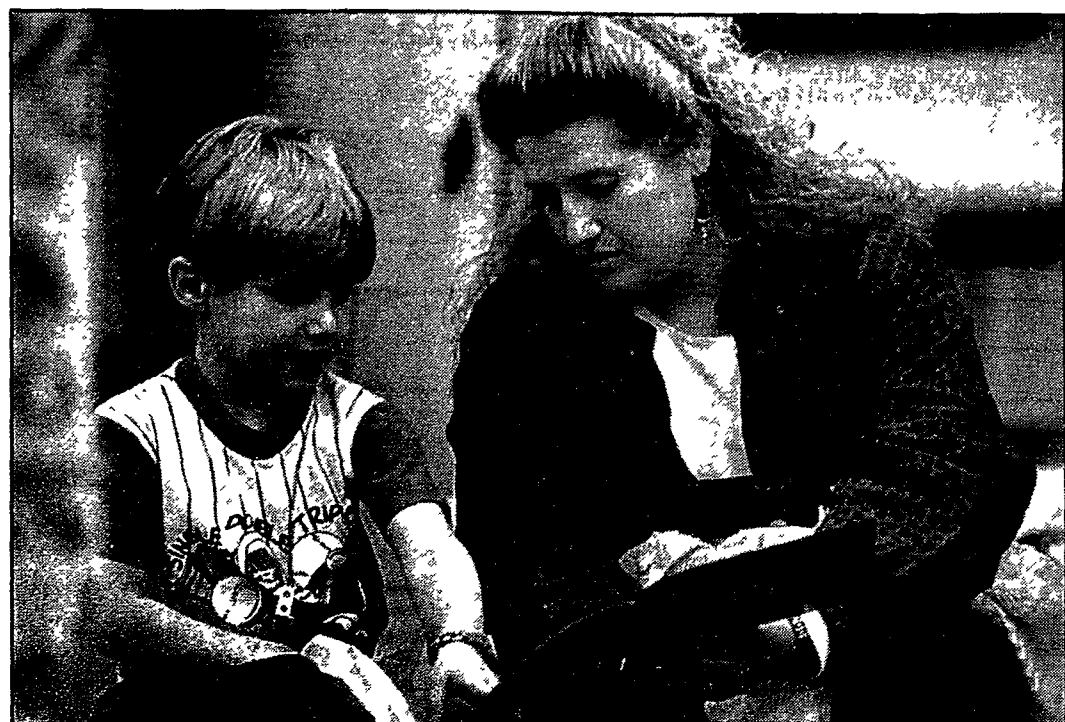

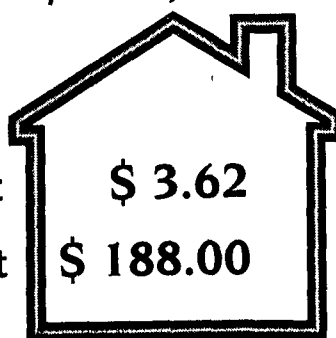

Scout Troop 755 marks golden anniversary

Charter document was drawn up in April, 1947

Boy Scout Troop 755 of Northville celebrated its 50th anniversary on May 17 with several activities and displays at Ford Field.

Present at the celebration were troop Eagles, former leaders, council and district representatives, and dignitaries and staff from Troop 755's sponsor, First Presbyterian Church of Northville.

The troop's application and charter was made on April 28, 1947, as Troop N-5. It was sponsored by The Men's Club of the First Presbyterian Church. Later the church became the sponsor. The troop number was changed from N-5 to 755 in 1956.

Scoutmasters since the Troop's inception were: Lawrence Parmenter, 1947-48; Robert Parmenter, 1948-49; Harold E. Wagenschutz, 1949-50; Rex LaPlante Jr., 1950-51; Harold E. Wagenschutz, 1951-54; Robert W. Clements, 1954-55; Earl S. Collins, 1955-56 when the Troop became 755 and 1956-58; Fred C. Spietz, 1958-61; Joseph Pietrock, 1961-62; Frank R. Oglesby, 1962-63; Billie W. Thomas, 1963-70; Henry D. Fisher, 1970-79; Warren Stoddard, 1979-82; James Lapham, 1982-90; William F. Stockhausen, 1990-94; and Joseph Retzbach, 1994-97.

Jeffrey Jacobs became Scoutmaster earlier this year.

A time capsule of memories, pictures and memorabilia was sealed at the activities event and carries a recommended opening date of 2022. Eagles and Scoutmasters were recognized during the day's ceremony.

During its 50 years the troop has had 75 Eagle Scouts and has enjoyed major representation at all five National Jamborees since 1981 (including this summer's event). It has also sent three or more Scouts to each of the three World Jamborees since 1987.

The Troop has gone on about 23 northern wilderness Canadian canoe treks since 1964, and has sent crews sojourning to the Florida Seabase twice and to Philmont Scout Ranch.

Among the adult leaders, the troop has a Distinguished Eagle, three Silver Beavers and five Woodbadge recipients.

Monthly troop campouts have found Scouts sleeping in a museum, a submarine, an igloo, a cave and even in a tent during a crisp below-zero night.

The Scouts have also camped on an island, hiked the rugged Niagara gorge, sledded on an Olympic luge, lashed a 40-foot observation tower, cooked and consumed a feast fit for a king, started a fire with only pieces of wood and string, and created a swarm of 40 kites at a fly-in.

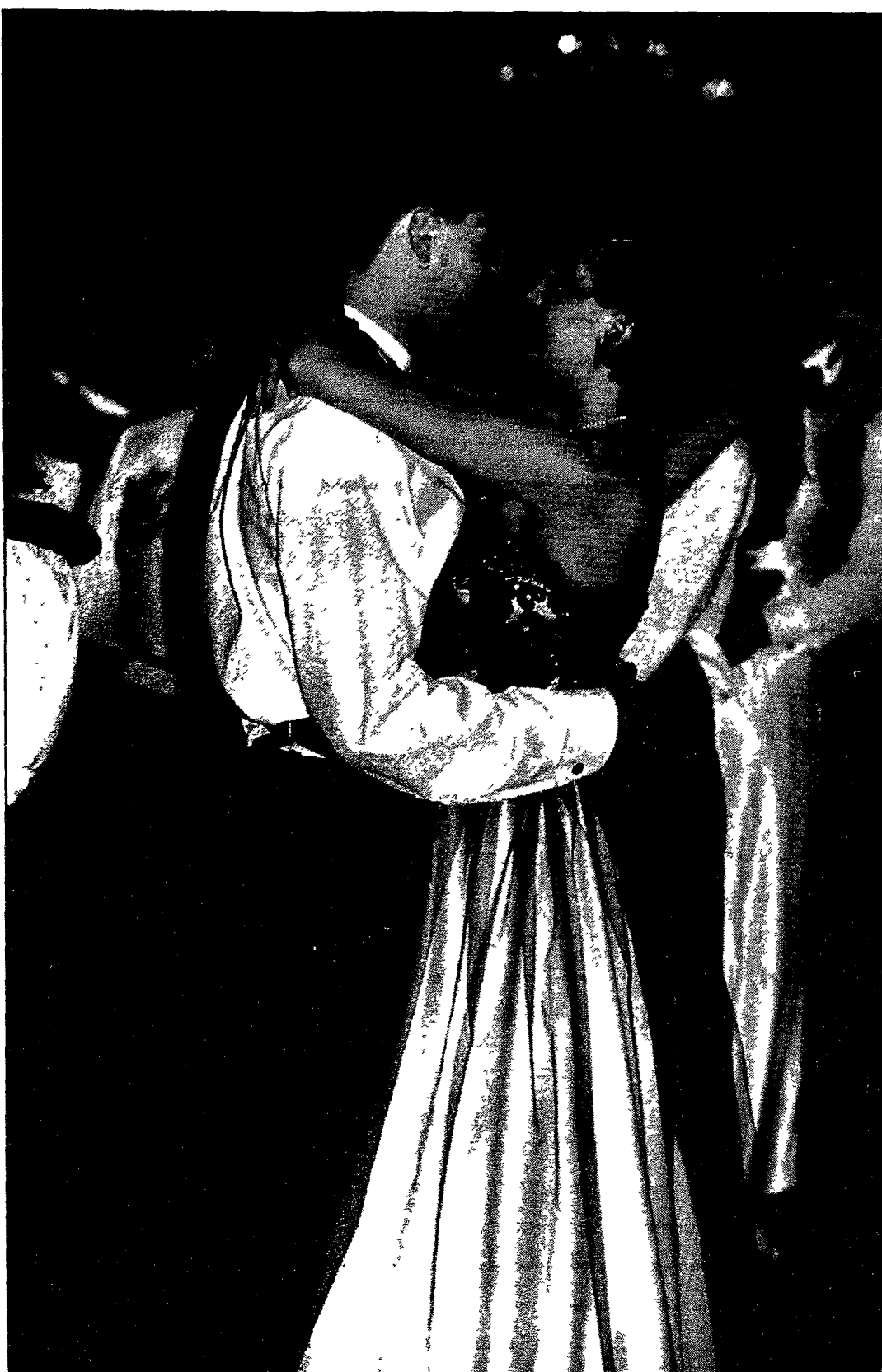

Special patrol campaign under way

Safe, Sober and Secure officers across Oakland County are stepping up their efforts this week and throughout the summer to target motorists who do not buckle their children appropriately in their vehicles.

Michigan law allows officers to stop a vehicle and issue citations when babies and toddlers are not buckled up. The driver can be

issued a citation for each child who is not buckled up.

Traffic crashes are the leading cause of death for children, according to the Traffic Improvement Association of Oakland County. Parents can reduce that risk with proper safety belt precautions.

All children 12 and under are safest in the backseat, and babies should ride in rear-facing infant seats until they weigh 20 pounds or more or are 1-year-old. At that point they should ride in a forward-facing child seat. Children too big for child seats should ride in booster seats.

While many parents skip the booster seat and put children in the automobile safety system, those belts are designed for adults and do not provide adequate protection until children weigh 70 to 80 pounds.

Officials say current units are outmoded

There may not be a shortage of computers in Northville schools, but chances are most of the units aren't making the grade as far as usefulness is concerned.

Purchased brand new in 1989 many computers found in Northville classrooms can't run the new, state-of-the-art software and have a hard time accessing data on the Internet.

That's the dilemma Northville teachers and students now face as the aging 8088 and 286 personal computers found in most district schools fail to provide students with the necessary learning devices for the rapidly changing world of computer technology.

School officials are attempting to upgrade the district's computer inventory with the help of local taxpayers. About \$5.2 million of

the \$61.5 million bond issue that goes before voters June 9 is earmarked for new technology, including multi-media computers.

According to Mark Vernacchia, who served on the citizens committee that developed the technology proposal, new computers are needed because much of the district's current inventory is outdated and can't run current software packages.

"New software requires more capabilities than many of the existing computers can support," he said.

Vernacchia, along with other proponents of the bond initiative, maintain that students will need to develop their ability to gather information, perform analyses, present new ideas, and communicate by utilizing technology.

"Those are critical skills that technology helps students devel-

op," he said.

Northville's technology problems mirror the results of a study conducted last September by the U.S. Department of Education. The study looked at schools nationwide and said that most use computers that are over 10 years old.

The study also concluded that the average student-per-computer ratio was extremely high in Michigan at roughly 8.4 students per computer.

Northville schools have an approximate average of 9.6 students per computer, and 39.2 per computer with multi-media capabilities, and the existing computers in the district's eight schools do not allow adequate access to technology during the school day, district officials say.

School proposal includes major technology investment

Other technicians and training personnel are expected to be phased in over a three to five year period, Rezmierski said.

"The school board and administration has made technology a priority commitment. In making that commitment we now need to ensure (general operating) funds are spent training personnel and supporting the new technology."

The school board's recent technology posture is completely different from the one posed in 1989, which was the last time district officials stressed the importance of integrating technology into the classroom.

The difference, according to Rezmierski, is that this time the school board and administration are developing a comprehensive plan to effect change.

"There have been no standards, no guidelines in place that would provide for computer training for teachers (in the past)," he explained. "It is difficult to integrate computer technology into the

classroom without first increasing the level of computer proficiency by teachers and staff."

Rezmierski said that negotiations are under way with the Northville Education Association to develop a training schedule for teachers. Also on tap for district officials is the development of standard computer proficiency levels for all employees.

"We have to be able to develop a common threshold of capacity for our staff to not only have the requisite computer knowledge, but for them to be able to demonstrate they can deliver that knowledge to our students," he explained. "Our teachers need to be able to teach their classes more effectively by using new technology."

According to Jerry Rupley, chairman of Continuing Excellence for Northville Children, the school board's commitment to funding technology sends an important message to voters.

"There's no doubt about it, the board and administration must demonstrate a commitment to

finding funds in their operating budget to hire technology personnel, regardless of whether a bond issue passes or fails," Rupley said. "You obviously can't have the equipment without the people to maintain and operate it and train personnel to use new technology."

Prosecutor seeks response from district

cards, public meetings and bus tours of the high school.

"I believe that the Northville Public Schools has, and is unlawfully expending public funds for political purposes, constituting malfeasance," Bernard said in his complaint.

He added that he wants the prosecutor's office to prevent the district from publishing information that asks for voter support of the bonds, and prohibit officials from using tax dollars for other "pro-bond" activities.

Bernard believes that school officials should repay the taxpayers for the paper, envelopes, postage and other costs incurred to disseminate the information.

District officials say the information sent to voters is legitimate and does not encourage approval for the bond proposal.

"All of the material was looked at by our attorney before it was sent out to the community," Assistant Superintendent Dave Bolitho said. "The material is all informational, which is allowed under state law."

He added that the district's letters were patterned after the information sent to voters during Northville city's attempt to gain voter approval for a dedicated road millage in February. Prior to the election Mayor Chris Johnson sent a letter to residents explaining the

millage request and how the funds would be spent.

Bolitho said district attorneys will respond to Bernard's request by the Thursday deadline.

The Secretary of State's office is also following the investigation with interest.

According to Anne Corgan, an attorney with the compliance and rules division of the Secretary of State's office, the prosecutor will have to determine whether the information sent out by the school district is a statement of fact or an improper use of public resources to campaign for approval of a ballot initiative.

That determination, she explained, isn't always easy.

"The state law is quite specific, but enforcing the law is purely subjective," she said.

"The courts can't even agree on a proper test of the law. Some courts have ruled that you have to have the buzz words to show that a school district is actively campaigning for a candidate or an issue, and other courts have ruled that any suggestion that a district is campaigning for approval is a

violation.

"Because there is no clear cut consensus each complaint has to be judged on a case-by-case basis."

Violation of the statute is considered a misdemeanor and could carry a sentence of 90 days in jail and/or a \$500 fine. Such sentences, however, are rarely, if ever, imposed.

Corgan explained that if a school district is found to be in violation of the law the Secretary of State's office usually attempts to resolve the matter informally.

"Essentially, what we do is attempt to recover any improper funds that have been spent without going to court," she said.

"The district can be creative in raising the funds to repay the public, but the bottom line is if the district cannot afford to repay the money, the funds would come out of the school board members' pockets."

"All school districts should be aware that there is a line out there that they cannot cross, and that line keeps moving around," she added.

may work independently on a crew but cannot use power tools.

Childcare services will be available and provided by First Presbyterian Church of Northville. Arrangements must be made ahead of time. Children may stay a maximum of four hours per day, and parents need to pack a lunch, breakfast, or sack dinner for their children, depending on the time of day.

Playscape co-chairman Kevin Hartshorne said the effort is receiving help from the neighboring Novi playscape committee, which will build its playground June 12-15.

"We're helping each other out," Hartshorne said. "When we're finished we'll lend them some equipment, like saw horses and other materials for their construction."

Hartshorne added that some of the Novi playscape volunteers will also be lending a hand for the Northville buildout.

Steve Smith, who is coordinating the tool donation task, said this week that playscape volunteers have acquired almost all of the tools they'll need.

"We have had a good response from local contractors and businesses as far as loaning the heavy equipment," he explained. "What we need now are individuals to step forward with their smaller, more typical tools like drills, saws, and shovels."

Smith said that the tools will be needed during the entire buildout and are guaranteed to be returned in as-good or better condition than when loaned. If a tool breaks during construction, it will be repaired or replaced, he said.

Tools still needed include three-eighths drills, 25 foot extension cords, hammers, belt sanders, circular saws, light strings, orbital jigsaws, garden rakes, routers, and 25 foot tape measures.

Also needed are No. 4 steel reinforcing rods, concrete bag mix, and play sand.

Tool drop-offs are scheduled for May 31, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.; June 1, from noon to 5 p.m.; and June 2 from 5 to 8 p.m.

All tools should be dropped off at the playscape site on Griswold, across from the Water Wheel Health Club.

During check-in, the tools will be labeled with an engraver or marker using a number system, according to Smith.

"Each donor will be assigned a number and all of their tools will be labeled with that number."

Smith is also seeking volunteers to work the tool trailer during buildout days.

"They will hand out tools to workers, repair tools, and change saw blades and drill bits," he said. "Retired people with tool experience, who may not

be able to do some of the heavier construction work, are perfect candidates for these positions."

Yurgalite said the experience will be fun for every-

enjoyed substantial success over the past several years, and we want this progress to continue," the letter stated. "However, it has become apparent there is a need to fund and coordinate downtown promotions, retain and recruit businesses, assist in fund-raising, and properly represent downtown interests with local government and the chamber of commerce."

"Many communities around Northville are becoming more aggressive and are working to improve the economic vitality of their respective cities," the letter continued. "We must effectively utilize our resources to maintain our competitive edge with other communities in our region."

The NCBA officers signing the document were Toni Genitti, Terry Bueter, Barbara Davies, and Lou Mascolo.

Word said that DDA approval of

the tax levy resolution was conditioned upon the DDA developing a partnership and a plan of action with the private sector before any of the revenue is spent.

"Should a workable plan fail to garner a consensus, the funds would be returned to the downtown property owners," Word explained.

The state statute governing downtown development authorities allows levied funds to be spent for most any reasonable purpose except capital improvements, according to Word.

"Consequently, it would need to be used for operational purposes but could also be spent on promotions, staff, or marketing," he said.

The DDA has expressed an interest in using the funds to hire a downtown development director, but no real discussions regarding a position of that nature have taken place, according to Word.

Debate over charter schools continues in state Legislature

State Capitol capsules:

Look for a battle of rhetoric when a bill to regulate public school academies — so-called "charter schools" — hits the full Michigan House of Representatives. Charter schools are tax-supported, specialized, self-organized schools operating under grants of authority from universities and the state Jobs Commission.

You will have trouble detecting that the warring factions are talking about the same measure, House Bill 4395, as reported out of the House Education Committee.

"We need accountability measures in place to ensure the education needs of children are being met," said the sponsor, Rep. James Agee, D-Muskegon, a former school superintendent and a gubernatorial hopeful.

Agee's bill:

- Requires each charter school to submit an annual report on oversight activities, non-compliance with the charter, areas of performance that need to be improved, assurances the school has no religious affiliation, and a plan to improve performance.

- Allows the State Board of Education to revoke the charter if a charter school fails to provide an annual oversight report.

- Specifies that, if the school closes, its real estate and personal property become the property of the state.

Opponents say charter schools already are heavily regulated since they must comply with the federal Americans with Disabilities Act, Open Meetings Act, their performance contracts with the authorizing agency and "the microscope of the media."

Senate majority leader Dick Posthumus, R-Alto, and House minority leader Ken Sikkema, R-Grandville, say Agee and allies are "enemies of charter schools who, unable to strangle this infant reform in its crib, have done their utmost to keep it from growing big and strong."

TOBACCO ADS HIT

The full Senate is due to take up a bill banning tobacco ads on billboards after it was reported out of the Local Government, Urban and State Affairs Committee.

Sponsor Loren Bennett, R-Canton, said, "These offensive forms of advertisement should no longer be permitted where they can be viewed by thousands of children everyday. It is painfully clear that these ads with their slick youthful messages are aimed directly at young people ..."

"Radio and television ads for tobacco products have been banned since the early 1970s," Bennett said. "It's a public health issue."

SENATE ADOPTS

The state Senate has passed and sent to the House:

- A package of bills sponsored

by Sen. Alma Wheeler Smith, D-Salem, to eliminate the terms "handicap," "handicapped" and "handicapper" in state law — terms Michiganians find "condescending," she said.

The bills use the word "disabilities."

- A bill by Bennett, R-Canton, to allow emergency medical technicians to use more of their training. Currently, state law permits a fire station or ambulance service to offer only basic care. SB 297 allows EMTs who have reached the highest licensure level to use all their skills, Bennett said.

NEW BILL

Sen. Mike Rogers, R-Brighton, has proposed a state income tax exemption for police officers who work and live in high-crime areas. The bill also would exempt them from auto registration and license plate fees.

The bill applies to both state and local police. Co-sponsors are Loren Bennett, R-Canton, and Leon Stille, R-Spring Lake.

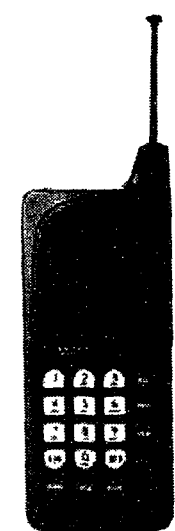
SUITS CURBED

A new state law taking effect June 1 will curb lawsuits by prison inmates by requiring them to pay their own filing fees. Sen. William VanRegenmorter, R-Jenison, the sponsor, said 2,000 prisoner suits — 90 percent of which have no merit — are filed annually, requiring 34 assistant attorneys general and staff at a cost of more than \$1.5 million a year.

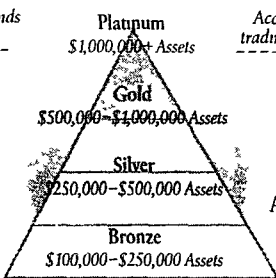

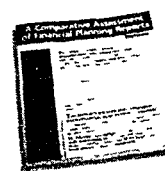

State budget outlook better than expected

State budget makers got \$83 million of good news when the House Fiscal Agency reported a rosier-than-expected revenue picture.

HFA told lawmakers the state was \$1.2 billion below the limit of \$21.7 billion imposed by the 1978 Headlee Amendment to the Michigan Constitution.

That failed to stop Bill McMaster, chairman of the gadfly Michigan Taxpayers United, from blistering the "ambush plan" of top Republican officials to raise fuel taxes about \$200 million.

"Any increase in gas taxes will have to be decided by taxpayers and not the governor or state legislators," McMaster said at a May 20 news conference in Pontiac.

He blistered Gov. John Engler, Oakland Executive L. Brooks Patterson and Brent Bair, the managing director of the Oakland Road

Commission, for seeking the fuel tax increase as part of what the governor calls his "Build Michigan II" program.

But the HFA report, released two days later, said the applicable limit is \$21.7 billion, based on 9.49 percent of state total personal income of \$228.4 billion for the current fiscal year, while revenue is projected at \$20.4 billion.

For fiscal 1998, beginning Oct. 1, the limit will be \$22.6 billion, while actual taxes are projected to be \$1.4 billion less.

The HFA report came as legislators put together school aid, uni-

versity and community college appropriations bills that are tens of millions of dollars higher than recommended in February by Engler's Department of Management and Budget.

In short:

- Baseline general fund revenues on May 22 were estimated at \$8.82 billion, or \$83 million higher than estimated last January.

- School aid fund revenues are estimated at \$8.66 billion, or \$68 million higher than the January estimate. The school aid fund consists of much of the 6 percent sales tax, lottery and other revenues

dedicated to K-12 public schools.

Mitchell Bean, senior economist for HFA, forecast a rosy picture for the Michigan economy during the rest of 1997 but a slower growth rate in 1998. Highlights:

- Personal income, which rose by 4.4 percent last year, will go up 5.4 percent this year and taper off to 4.6 percent in 1998.

- Unemployment, after hitting a low of 4.4 percent last month, will average 4.7 percent for the entire year and 4.8 percent in 1998.

- Inflation, as measured by the Detroit consumer price index, will

drop from last year's 2.7 percent to 2.6 percent this year and 2.5 percent in 1998.

Michigan's "rainy day fund," an accumulated surplus to be used in times of recession, rose to \$1.15 billion for fiscal 1995-96 (which ended last Sept. 30). The fund will grow to \$1.23 billion this Sept. 30 and \$1.31 billion for fiscal 1997-98 (beginning Oct. 1).

The HFA forecaster assumed a federal budget deal between Congress and the Clinton Administration that will result in a balanced budget by 2002.

"The projected federal budget

incorporates spending restraints in discretionary spending and entitlements, including modest increases in health and education programs favored by the administration," HFA said.

"It appears that the (federal) budget will include some combination of a tax cut on capital gains, a reduction in the estate tax, and tax credits for families with children and for higher education expenses."

It added, "The (national) economy is now expected to enter a period of relatively strong growth and low unemployment rates."

The fourth annual statewide coloring contest was sponsored by the MDA and Procter & Gamble. The contest was open to children in kindergarten through sixth grades, with four categories: kindergarten; first and second grade; third and fourth grades; and fifth and sixth grades.

Yes, it's asking a lot, but there's good reason

We'll avoid the temptation to say that the Northville school system is at a crossroad, but it certainly is true that it's time for district residents to do some serious soul searching.

The district is at a point now where major retooling is in order and the upcoming bond election has provided an opportunity to ask some basic questions about the direction of public education in Northville.

What do we want for current and future generations of school children? Do we want to keep class sizes at their current average of 24-26 students, or will quality of instruction be unaffected by larger classrooms? Do we need to retain the current middle school concept of sixth through eighth grades, or should we revert to the old junior high format of seventh through ninth? What level of computer technology is needed to prepare today's students for the global information systems they'll manage one day?

Fundamental questions such as these are being asked as voters ponder the merits of the school district's \$61.5 million bond request, scheduled to receive its verdict at the polls June 9.

Last September, voters turned down an almost identical proposal by a 54 to 46 percent margin. A companion request for a one-time levy of 1.95 mills was also defeated, but the availability of the so-called "enhancement" millage has, by law, expired.

As a result, the lone question on the ballot will be this: Should voters authorize the district to sell revenue bonds to finance a major construction program and provide new technology additions? As with last fall's proposal, we believe the answer is an unqualified YES.

If voters give their assent, bonds will be sold to finance several improvements, the most important of which is the construction of a new high school on land the school district owns off Six Mile in Northville Township. Approximately \$48.7 million of the money would be devoted to that purpose alone.

Among the other big-ticket items is the conversion of the current high school into a middle school and six classroom additions onto Silver Springs Elementary.

Cooke Middle School would then be used to house the district's special education students, who currently attend class in a leased building in Livonia.

A host of other building improvements are planned, everything from air conditioning replacement and new carpeting at Meads Mill to roofing and sidewalk improvements at Amerman Elementary.

The other major component of the program is approximately \$5.2 million in technology additions, including hundreds of personal computers for class-

rooms in all buildings, new computer labs and high speed on-line services. Additional technology support staff and teacher training are also part of the program.

The plan would be paid for by an unspecified millage increase that would average 2.5 mills annually for the next 26 years. The district currently levies 3.5 mills for debt retirement and that would jump to 6.0 mills beginning next tax season.

It's a lot to ask of taxpayers, no doubt, but for several reasons we think the package is warranted.

It's apparent that the schools are approaching capacity and that more space is needed. Portable classrooms have already been approved for use at the two middle schools beginning next year, and projections put the student population at Northville High School over capacity in 1998-99.

(Those population estimates, by the way, don't take into account the influx of residents from the huge land development concluded in April between Wayne County and Northville Township. More than 1,300 housing units will be built in the next few years as a result of that agreement.)

Suggestions that class sizes could be increased to stave off overcrowding are not, in our opinion, practicable. No exhaustive studies need to be cited to demonstrate the point that education thrives in an environment where there's a low student-to-teacher ratio. Increasing class sizes beyond the current 24-26 average would be a definite move in the wrong direction, and anyone who cares about quality schools should pay little heed to such an idea.

More reasonable alternatives have concentrated on proposals to build a new middle school or conserve space by resorting to the old junior high format of grouping together grades seven through nine.

But even those suggestions are flawed because they overlook the fact that overcrowding occurs at all grade levels, and that shifting students around could not possibly represent a longterm solution to the problem of steady growth.

Northville school district taxpayers are faced with a decision about where their priorities lie. Is it important for them to continue to provide adequate facilities for current and future generations of school children? If so, the vote must be YES on June 9.

A truly grand sight to behold

Don't look now but it's almost playscape construction time. As the June 4-8 Fort Griswold "buildout" dates approach, committee members are busy putting the finishing touches on the mammoth volunteer effort that will culminate in the raising of the huge wooden structure.

More volunteer builders are needed, so don't be shy. Sign up for a shift or two by calling Sue Egan at 347-4756.

And if you're all thumbs the way I am, don't think there's nothing you can do to help. There'll be something for every conceivable skill level, I promise.

I've written before about what it was like in Grosse Ile, the site of the other playscape construction project I, as a journalist, participated in.

What a spectacle that was back in October 1991. I'm not exaggerating (well, not much anyway) when I say the whole thing looked like a scene from some epic movie.

A sea of humanity swarmed around the construction area. Teams of volunteers resembled bees buzzing around a hive as they hauled materials, cut planks and studied design plans. Crews labored late into the night using generator flood lights to illuminate the work area.

Before construction began, I didn't think there was anything I could do to contribute, seeing as though I have to allow an entire afternoon just to change a

headlight bulb on the car. But they kept me occupied spreading gravel and pounding nails. I assume they'll put me to work on similar no-brainer (but important) tasks next week.

By the time it was all over in Grosse Ile more than 1,000 people had pitched in and lent a hand, roughly one-tenth of the population of the whole community.

At the end of the five-day construction period everyone had the satisfaction of standing back, taking a deep breath and admiring their handy work. I remember savoring the contrast as the adults gazed intently at the magnificent playset while the kids, oblivious to everything but their games, had a blast running through the maze of tunnels, enclosures and bridges.

But probably the best part came when I interviewed the volunteers about how it felt to be a part of something so special. Each one I talked to, without exception, sang the praises of the effort and spoke in almost lyrical terms about the strong sense of community they experienced at the worksite.

They all came away from the project with their own account of the extraordinary power of numbers. Many even said their involvement renewed their belief in the spirit of cooperation and the idea that, when people join together, anything is possible.

I have a feeling we're going to hear a lot of the same kind of superlatives here in Northville come June 8, when people brush themselves off, wipe their hands clean and feast their eyes on the finished product.

Take it from one who's been there, that'll make it all worthwhile.

I visited my old stomping grounds, Orchard Hills, and I stopped by Parkview Elementary where I ran into a former neighbor.

The playgrounds seemed almost the same, except there were some things missing. The Pizza Slide is long gone.

It doesn't surprise me. The triangle shaped piece of equipment was a menace.

The goal was to climb up the slanted part of the slide using only your arms, your legs hung down the slide, then once you reached the 90 degree angle at the top, you let go. Well, needless to say, somebody was always letting go too soon, causing a crash that resulted in a bump or a bruise.

The Old Fort is also long gone.

The two-tiered wooden structure had two holes for a door on the bottom and a splintery wooden ladder to

climb to the top. Once you got outdoors for recess, it was always a race to see who could get there first.

Sometimes, the girls would make it first and try to block out the boys by guarding the doors and pushing them off the ladder.

Other times, the boys would chase the girls into the fort and hold them hostage.

Sometimes the girls would kiss the boys to gross them out and we would escape.

What strange dynamics, now that I think of it. No wonder they tore it down.

Of the pieces that do remain I have fond memories.

There are still the swings at the top of the hill, where if you swing high enough and jump you might land on the bottom.

There is still the rock on the south side where the fourth graders used to congregate, too cool to play on the playground.

And there is the vast wilderness south of the rock where you really weren't supposed to go, but a grade-school friend and I always did. The trees and bushes formed beautiful canopies and little hiding spaces. We would watch the clouds and dream of things to come until the whistle blew.

We had a special name for it, Tarabithia, named after a book we both loved.

It was our sacred island.

What struck me the most in talking to the kids last week was their need for freedom and space, for places to crawl and hide, for room to run.

Anyone who says that 35 in a class can learn as well as 26 and bases his conclusions on undocumented "research" is neither credible nor convincing. The research that I know of which supports smaller class size includes:

- Tennessee's Project STAR (Student Teacher Achievement Ratio) which studied the effects of small class size in the early primary grades in reading and mathematics and persuaded the Tennessee Legislature to mandate and fund class sizes of 17 in grades K-3 by 2002.

- "Bigger classes mean lower SAT scores." Powell and Steelman as cited by Gerald Bracey in *Phi Delta Kappan*, September 1996.

- "Accidents are more likely to occur in science labs that are overcrowded or where science is taught in a room that is not intended for science instruction." Flinn Scientific Inc., Flinn Fax, Vol-

ume 97-2, 1997.

Learning requires the student to be actively involved, to make personal connections, to be engaged over time, to get timely feedback, and to have misunderstandings corrected. Common sense, not only research, tells us that the possibilities for the best learning conditions diminish as the number of students in a class grows.

Most adults also realize that school is a place where students define themselves, establish positive relationships and a sense of belonging. We all know, too, the feelings of isolation and anonymity that come with being part of a crowd. Ratios of 35 students to one teacher are more of a crowd than a class. Please vote "yes" for the bond issue on Monday, June 9.

Low class size a critical issue

As a parent of two elementary school children, I don't need studies to tell me that for the majority of students, smaller class size means more efficient instruction. When my daughter was in kindergarten, there were 31 students in her class. My son's kindergarten class was smaller - 24 students. Both had fine teachers but who do you think had more time for her students? I have volunteered and assisted in every one of my children's classrooms. I have seen firsthand the difference.

I think most people would agree that elementary students benefit from small class size. What about those older kids? Shouldn't high school and middle school kids be able to handle increased class size? Kids are kids. Most everyone benefits from being in classes that enable the student to have some one-on-one time with a teacher. Granted, some students will do well under the most adverse conditions.

However, if our goal as a district is to help every student reach his or her potential, then let's do it.

Let's ensure that our teachers have classes that are manageable and conducive to learning. Let's make sure that they have class sizes that enable them to spend extra time with a student who needs it.

That analysis, of course, is qualitative. Looking at the numbers it's not hard to see that when our current third, fourth, fifth and sixth graders are in high school, that population will be 200 students over capacity. That number doesn't even take new housing into account.

Our middle schools will be over capacity next fall. Our high school and elementary schools will over capacity next year. This year's kindergarten class is the largest our district has ever seen. These are not temporary bulges in enrollment. Northville will continue to grow.

Enlarging class size to accommodate increased enrollment is an option. But it is not a sound option. Most parents want class sizes at the current level or lower. I know I do. If we don't fix the problem now, we'll be paying for it later. Vote yes for our students and teachers on Monday, June 9.

State's turnaround is welcome news

I don't often listen to broadcast news programs but because this newspaper's Tim Richard is a panelist on the June 1 "Spotlight on News" on Channel 7, I listened with care.

Featuring a group of local experts including Oakland University's distinguished retired professor of business administration, Karl D. Gregory, the program focused on prospects for the economy in southeastern Michigan.

The panel's conclusion: It's good now and likely to remain so.

Of course, Michigan still depends heavily on the auto industry. But the structure of the industry is very different from the 1980s, when we experienced a recession every three or four years and Gov. G. Mennen Williams used to complain that, when the nation caught a cold, Michigan came down with pneumonia.

First, the industry seems finally to have learned a lesson from its "boom and bust" past.

Each of the Big Three has downsized, substantially improved productivity, pounded down the break even point and accumulated gigantic cash reserves - all in the realization that today's prosperity has hardly repealed the

business cycle. Demand for cars and trucks seems to be tailing off a bit, but the auto companies are in a much, much better position to ride out the tough times.

Moreover, the composition of the auto workforce in Michigan has changed significantly over time. While auto assembly remains an important part of the economy, the auto industry has built lots of assembly plants around the country, leaving at headquarters in Michigan a disproportionate share of white-collar labor force of engineers and managers, folks who are unlikely to get laid off when a downturn comes.

Indeed, the bigger problem appears to be finding enough people with suitable skills to meet what looks very much like an absolute labor shortage. Kurt Metzger, the director of Wayne State University's Michigan Metropolitan Information Center, predicts 52,000 new auto-related jobs in Oakland County alone by the end of the century.

The problem here is what economists call a mismatch in local labor markets. While employers are crying out for skilled workers, the supply from area schools and apprentice programs is not increasing.

Worse, many people who want jobs and have (or can learn) the required skills live in Detroit, where lack of mass transit or access to a car prevent them from getting to the jobs now opening up in suburban locations.

Indeed, according to the experts on the program, it now appears that the very meaning of "local labor market" is changing. Instead of thinking about a labor market defined by the

city of Livonia, for example, or even Oakland County, it appears that the entire area from Port Huron to Toledo to Ann Arbor is becoming a regional labor market, with complicated patterns of supply and demand working throughout the area.

One expert remarked that while "two stadiums and three casinos do not make a world class city" (referring to Detroit Mayor Dennis Archer's boast that Detroit is "on the verge of becoming a world class city"), it may well be that we are seeing the creation of a world class region.

Files in the ointment? Sure. We could see a recession in the next year or so.

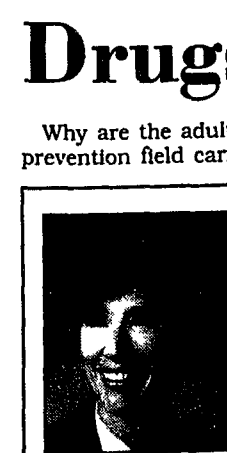
Worse, many banks that used to have their corporate headquarters in Michigan have been bought out - National Bank of Detroit is now headquartered in Chicago, Michigan National has been bought by an Australian bank holding company and Standard Federal's takeover by a Dutch concern has just been finalized.

Although there is little current evidence this change of focus has had much effect, I cannot believe that we will see in the foreseeable future the sort of local focus and concern that existed while ownership was firmly rooted in the state.

But, according to the experts, Michigan has become a pretty secure place to find work and raise a family. For those of us who remember the 1970s and 1980s, that's a big and welcome change.

adolescent's use.

A recent article by Heath Meriwether in the *Detroit Free Press* suggests that while it's great to create lots of new jobs for young people (e.g., empowerment zone employment), the new employee must also learn some basic skills that will assure him or her of not only getting the job, but keeping it.

Nakia Thomas, a senior at Detroit's high school for the Fine and Performing Arts, commented in Meriwether's article that she learned what it takes to be a good employee last summer while participating in the summer jobs program co-sponsored by the *Free Press*.

"You have to be on time. You have to perform to the best of your ability and beyond. You've

got to work with people and take orders. You've got to dress appropriately. You're not going to like everyone you meet but you have to get along with people."

Thomas is right on the mark as to what employers expect. Are adolescents able to perform in a responsible way? Not if they are using or abusing alcohol or drugs. Ask any recovering kid how easy it was for him or her to hold down a job when they were using or bingeing.

"I cannot tell ya how hard it was to get up and get to a job after a night of getting trashed," remarked Kevin, a recovering 20-year-old. "Dragging yourself out of bed even when you didn't use the night before is only half the battle, followed by rummaging through the dirty laundry to find something that at least doesn't smell too bad to wear. Then there's that nasty obligation to perform to the best of one's ability ... ugh. Don't even feel like being there in the first place. It's boring too. Then there was crabby bosses ... she was so ugly and I didn't feel like being nice to her. Nobody else liked her anyway. If she got in my face, that was it. I told her where to get off. Then one day I did that one too many times ... she said I was fired. Next job, they fired me when I showed up late three times. The next boss said I had an attitude. I used to blame it on everyone else. When I stopped using, I discovered who was to blame. It's not easy to look in the mirror and realize that the source of all these problems was me."

Kevin isn't unusual. Even those adolescents

who binge on weekends only suffer the repercussions of a bad attitude, laziness and no motivation. Employers don't like "kids with an attitude." They aren't easy to work with. They don't take criticisms easily and have a poor work ethic.

How can we send our adolescents out into the workplace and be assured that they'll represent themselves as people of integrity and character? Two solutions:

- Watch out for them. Make sure we are fully aware of their whereabouts and who they are with.

- Guide them. Begin molding them into the children you want when they're preschoolers. Do they know how detrimental drugs, alcohol and tobacco are for young people? Do they know your family values and belief system? Do you take every window of opportunity to teach your child a lesson of life?

With interest, bill is a whopper

School numbers don't add up

To the editor:

The Northville Record's recent front page article on the upcoming bond issue shows new numbers for school enrollment and capacity than was in the fall bond report. First the high school capacity has been dropped from 1,435 to 1,350 and the middle school's from 1,200 to 1,100. Secondly, the 2000-01 high school enrollment projects have increased from 1,575 to 1,619 and the middle school from 1,325 to 1,372.

Where these changes made to increases the need for a new high school?

What is more disturbing is the change in high school average-capacity classroom size. It was increased from 22.4 (Facilities Report) to 26 (Last week's Record). This change appears unreal. How can high school average class size increase by 16 percent while school capacity drops by 6 percent?

Must we be rushed into a new high school?

With an average capacity high school classroom size of only 22.4 there is room to increase classroom size by a couple of students, if needed, while a better longterm school plan is developed.

It is highly likely that an expansion of the present high school and Cooke Middle School, or a return to a 10-12 high school and a 7-9 junior high school, would be a more economical approach than the bond proposal.

And I know many parents would welcome the latter change because many feel putting ninth graders into high school and sixth graders into middle schools is not good.

And is there wisdom in rushing into building a new high school without making an in-depth study of its effect on operating costs, busing and private transportation? Hardly.

Perhaps some people are hoping to justify a new high school by such "fudging" but I think both

parents and taxpayers will realize that this bond proposal should be defeated so some good overall planning can be done before committing the school system to such a path.

So let the parents and taxpayers unite and say "no" to a poorly conceived and taxpayer inconsiderate \$61.5 bond proposal.

It was very gratifying to be involved with the construction of Thornton Creek. It was very carefully planned to meet the needs of a modern elementary school. The community is proud of their new school.

We need to plan to retire our older buildings as we provide for the growth of our developing community. For this reason I support the June 9 millage proposal.

In my world, I would not have a future if I did not listen to a decision and did not present innovative, imaginative solutions.

Intelligent taxpayers expect and deserve more. These issues are far too serious to be labeled as anti-tax or anti-school sentiment. The facts conclusively prove that this is another proposal that does not warrant our approval. Resolve the list of unanswered questions that extend beyond this letter before seeking our approval.

Novi starts its own bike patrol

You may not be surprised by screaming sirens and flashing lights, but you may find a smile and a wave hello from Novi's friendly neighborhood bike patrol officer.

As part of a new trend called Community Policing, Novi cops are ready to take off with plans for a six-person bike patrol.

Although not set to necessarily peddle through residential subdivisions just yet, the hope is the program can be expanded.

"It seems to have great value in a wide range of communities," Novi Police Chief Douglas Shaeffer said.

The bike patrol will only work overtime at first so as not to strip the regular patrols of officers, Shaeffer said. In addition, he said the patrol could be better used in more intense situations like the Michigan '50s Festival, which brings thousands of visitors to the city each summer.

However, Officer Thomas Lindberg said he hopes the day will come when the bike patrol can do more.

"You can get into a lot of different areas that you can't with patrol cars," said Lindberg, referring to wooded trails, fields and parks.

Lindberg said the mountain bikes will enable the police to issue more ATV violations and locate teenage field parties. Cops will also be able to do surveillance work because people will be looking for patrol cars, not bikes.

"They are stealth and less visible yet cover a lot of ground," Shaeffer added.

Four of the six bike patrol riders attended 40 hours of training in Ann Arbor at the International Mountain Bike Police Training Association.

Northville is now in its second year with a bicycle patrol program. The officer assigned to the patrol, Mike Carlson, has made traffic stops and arrests while riding through the city on his bike.

Wixom suspect said to be delusional

Gerald Atkins is afraid the government is after him.

The 29-year-old Wixom man faces 26 felony counts, including the first-degree murder of plant supervisor Darrell Izzard during a shooting rampage through the Ford Motor Co. Wixom Plant in November. He is also accused of wounding a Ford employee and two sheriff's deputies.

Atkins appeared in 52-1 District Court in Novi on May 22 to hear the results of a second psychiatric report that concluded he is still incompetent to stand trial.

But the prosecution isn't satisfied with the ruling and has hired a well-known forensic psychiatrist of its own.

"We dispute the report of the Center that the defendant is feeling depressed and hopeless and acting as if the government is after him," said Cheryl Matthews, assistant prosecutor for the case.

"Those are very natural and normal feelings for the defendant to have right now."

The latest report issued by Betty

Ellerson confirmed a previous report by Thomas Shazer of the Center for Forensic Psychiatry in Ypsilanti that claims Atkins understands the charges against him but is unable to assist in his defense and needs treatment, Judge Harold Bulgarelli said.

"While cognizant of the charges against him, (Atkins) is unwilling to assist his attorney in this matter," said Bulgarelli.

It is Ellerson's opinion that Atkins does not meet the competency requirements under the law and requires further treatment, Bulgarelli said.

The judge ordered Atkins back to the center for 90 days of treatment and approved the prosecution's request to complete an independent study within 30 days.

According to Matthew's the prosecutor's office has retained Dr. Charles Clark, a forensic psychiatrist in Ann Arbor used many times by the office. Depending on Clark's findings, Matthews said she may ask that the trial begin immediately.

"I'm anxious to get this started," she told the judge.

Darrell Izzard's family has attended all of the hearings since November.

"This is hell for the family to go through," Matthews said.

However, Bulgarelli said the defense can request its own independent study within the 30 days after Clark's findings are reported.

Atkins was charged Nov. 15 in 52-1 District Court with 26 felony counts, including first-degree murder, 12 counts of felony firearms violations, 11 counts of assault with intent to murder, being a felon in possession of a firearm and auto theft.

Atkins is accused of killing Ford employee Darrell Izzard, 57, of Brighton, after shooting him four times with a military-style assault rifle.

Izzard was shot in the calf, hip, chest and elbow.

Two Oakland County Sheriff's Deputies and an independent contractor working at the plant were wounded during the shooting.

If convicted on first-degree murder charges, Atkins faces a mandatory sentence of life in prison.

Rep protests vote on records

There's danger in the brief amendment to the Public Health Code, said Rep. Greg Kaza, R-Rochester, who was on the short end of a 95-2 vote on House Bill 4450 in Lansing recently.

The bill allows county clerks to act as registrars for cities of 40,000 or more for "vital" records such as birth, death, marriage and divorce. Kaza said it could "invade the privacy" of individuals.

But he warned that "security issues are raised by the possibility that unauthorized persons may secure access to computer hardware and software for malicious purposes." The bill, on its way to the Senate, should be repaired as it affects computer data bases.

"Do we really want to place the birth certificates of the children of our constituents on the Internet?" Kaza said in a formal protest.

Book addresses abuse, obstacles

It's been a long time coming, but Dr. Gail Majcher's book *A Worthy Woman: My Memoirs as a Survivor of Domestic Violence* is on the shelves at Bookstall on the Main in Northville.

A book signing is scheduled for Saturday, May 31, at 1:30 p.m. at the store, located at 101 N. Center.

"I promised myself that if I survived the violent marriage I would write a book about it and now is the time," Majcher said.

Although the book only took a year to write and self publish, it was 20 years in the making.

While writing the book, Majcher relived some of her memories.

"I stopped and wept for that young girl that was in that terrible situation," she said. "I wish I had had a book like this back then."

Majcher cites two reasons for writing the book. The first is to reach women who are in violent marriages.

"Even when all strikes are against you, you can get out," she said. "I want women to know they can do that, it is not a dead end. They can go forward in life."

Majcher had nothing going for her, no money, no education, and two babies when she fled an abusive husband.

The second reason is to educate society about domestic violence. Majcher's book addresses why women get into such situations, why they stay, and how they can get out.

A resident of Northville for two years, Majcher left a violent four-year marriage two decades years ago.

Everything was wonderful prior to the marriage. The violence began on the honeymoon when something set her new husband off.

Majcher, who had been raised in

a home with all girls, had never seen anything so intense and violent. The frequency and intensity increased.

At first Majcher made excuses - things would be different after the first child, after they bought a home, after the second child, and if she was a perfect wife. But she realized that the problem wasn't her, it was him.

The look of terror on the faces of her two young children when her husband came after her one night was the last straw in her decision to leave the marriage.

"I could not have my innocent children exposed to this insanity," she said.

About four months later, she sneaked out of the house and moved into a tiny flat. She went on welfare and started at ground zero.

She lived in fear for a long time, but especially the first night as her husband stood outside the building banging on the door and screaming.

"We survived and survived well," she said. "I was terrified that he would come after me and kill me. I was always looking over my shoulder for a while."

"As time went by the threats became less. He kind of got on with his own life and left me alone."

Majcher went on to college where she received bachelor's and master's degrees as well as a doctorate in clinical psychology. She now has a private practice in Livonia.

"In retrospect I am so thankful, becoming a psychologist was a perfect profession because of my personality," she said.

In the center of the book is a journal Majcher kept leading up to her move from the marital home and continuing through the following year.

"Fortunately, I have very strong faith and I just believed that some-

how this was going to turn around and life was going to be OK," she said. "I clung to that belief and it came to be true."

The book also includes the dynamics of her family during childhood, many aspects of which are common to abused women.

In private practice, she sees so many similar dynamics that have taken place.

"It's my story but also the story of so many other women I have seen," she said.

"It is not just a book about

domestic violence, it is also a book about overcoming obstacles," Majcher said. "This (book) is about domestic violence but it can be any obstacle."

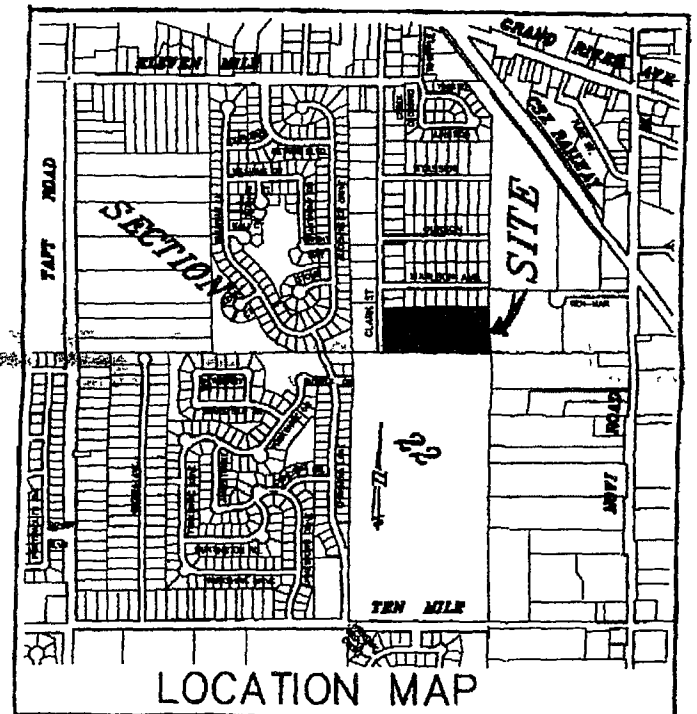

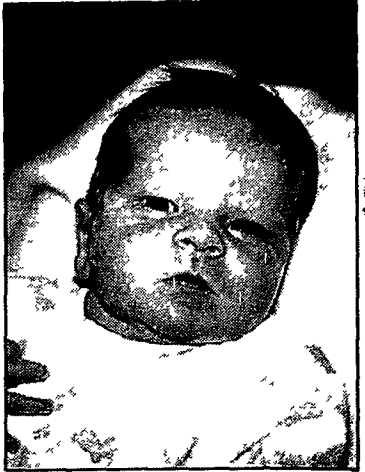

Garden of the Month

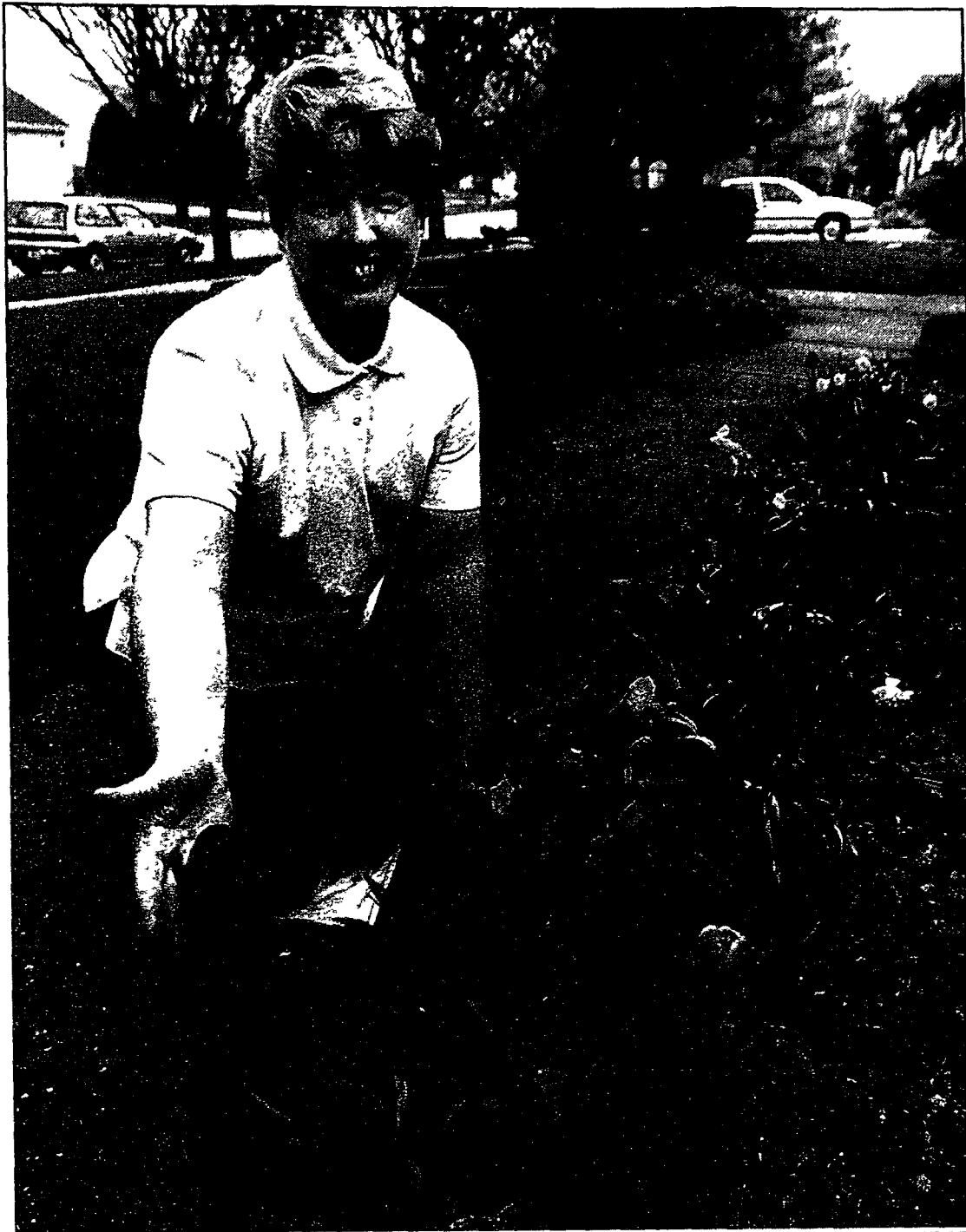

Garden grows each year as new rose bushes arrive

Spring has sprung, the grass has riz, and I know where the flowers iz ... in the garden of Carolyn and Ron Abramovich on Clement Court in Lexington Commons.

The blooms offer irrefutable and fragrant testimony to all doubters that spring has really arrived: proof to those whose thermostats remain set at 75 degrees and who won't leave the house without diving into fleece-lined parkas and snow boots.

Spring may not fill the air, but it fills the garden with graceful forsythia bushes backing large crescent-shaped beds filled with brilliantly colored tulips interspersed with clusters of daffodils, grape hyacinths, bloodroot, johnny-jump-ups, narcissus, forget-me-nots, fragrant hyacinths and arabis.

A red Canadian cherry tree stands close to the family room with its branches outstretched protecting the wildflowers below, which include trillium, Jacob's ladder, spiderwort, Virginia bluebells, bishop's cap, lily of the valley, columbine, wild larkspur, campanula and wild ginger.

Another bed on the south side of the yard will soon produce varieties of hybrid Asiatic lilies, daylilies in shades of orange, apricot and yellow, alongside beebalm, delphinium, Siberian and Japanese iris, lupines, gloriosa daisy, ageratum, poppy and Maltese cross.

Throughout the area are gold flame and bridal

wreath spirea, a Bradford pear tree, lilac bushes filling one corner, and several trellises that will soon host clematis and honeysuckle.

For the past 22 years, Carolyn has been a test panel member for Jackson & Perkins. The company sends her four rose bushes each year which she scores for a number of factors, including vigor, blooming, substance, fragrance and disease tolerance. Currently there are over 40 selections in the rose bed. If this "growing interest" continues, she'll need to lease space from the neighbors.

Added to the delightful garden design are Carolyn's hand-made mosaic stepping stones, created by placing a stained glass design in the bottom of a mold and then adding cement. After the cement hardens, the finished product is popped from the mold (like an upside down cake) and in 30 days (after concrete has cured) is ready to be placed in the garden. Most of the designs chosen are floral motifs, but the possibilities are endless. Recently a patron ordered two "golfer" stones as gifts for her husband.

This wonderful garden is both interesting and beautiful. And if you believe that every living thing responds positively to tender loving care, then Carolyn will be rewarded with a season filled with healthy and beautiful plants.

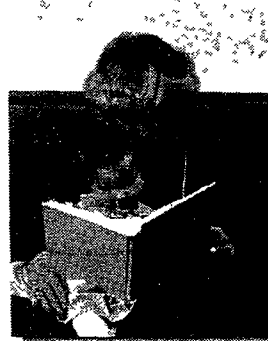

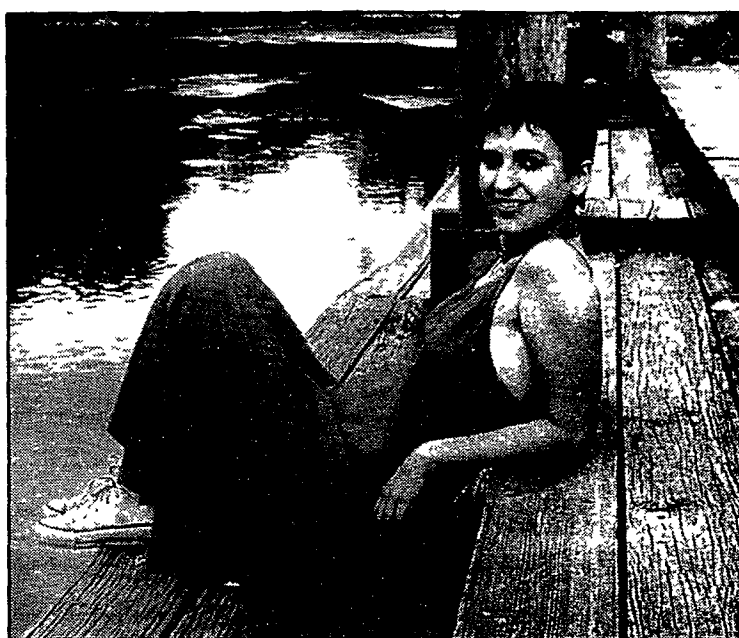

Outrageous 'Trial & Error' opens in theaters Friday

"Trial and Error," dubbed the second most outrageous trial of the century, is a comedy about a well-intentioned, out-of-work actor who poses as an attorney to defend a man on trial for fraud.

The film, which stars Michael Richards, Jeff Daniels, Charlize Theron, Jessica Steen and Rip Torn, will be released nationally on Friday by New Line Cinema.

Michael Richards, who plays Kramer on "Seinfeld," plays Richard Rietti, who has planned an outrageous bachelor party for his best friend, Charles Tuttle (Jeff Daniels). Charles has just been made a partner in a big firm and he's going to marry the daughter of the senior partner. However, Charles' boss has dispatched his future son-in-law to a desert town to handle a secret family legal matter.

Richard is not about to let work keep his friend from the well-planned evening of debauchery, so he decides to take the party to Charles. He and a few of his friends from acting class take the celebration on the road. When Charles checks into his hotel, he is less than thrilled to find Richard and his flaky entourage revved up and ready to party.

Charles is uptight and nervous about his fast-approaching wedding to his materialistic fiancée Tiffany (Alexandra Wentworth) and is in desperate need of a way to

unwind. He reluctantly agrees to a night on the town — a night that leaves him bruised, babbling and nearly comatose.

The next morning, Charles is supposed to appear in court at a trial that will make or break his career. When Richard is unable to snap Charles out of his hung-over stupor, he grabs Charles' suit and heads over to the court house to save his friend's career.

Richard only has to deliver one line: "Your Honor, my client requests a continuance." What should have been only a "walk-on" role turns into the performance of his career when the simple motion is denied, and the trial is scheduled to begin immediately.

With the skill of a lawyer whose education consists of reading the scholarly journal *Dramalogue*, Richard clumsily commences defending his "client," Benny Gibbs (Rip Torn), a mail-order con artist who has been defrauding pensioners by selling "engraved copper portraits of Abraham Lincoln," commonly known as pennies.

When Charles comes to, he finds Richard knee-deep in a charade that could land everyone in jail. Knowing his brilliant law career will be destroyed if the truth is discovered, Charles hides his true identity and poses as Richard's law clerk. Meanwhile, Richard becomes obsessed with winning the case and relishes his role as lead counsel.

Rebuffed and ultimately kicked

out of the courtroom, Charles finds comfort in Billie (Charlize Theron), a waitress he met during his bachelor party. Through his growing relationship with Billie, Charles begins questioning the direction of his life.

When Richard falls for the prosecuting attorney (Jessica Steen) he feels compelled to tell the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth.

Directed by Jonathan Lynn ("My Cousin Vinny") and produced by Lynn and Academy Award-nominated screenwriter Gary Ross ("Dave," "Big"), "Trial and Error" is a movie where deception ultimately leads to a discovery of truth, both in the courtroom and in the evolution of Richard and Charles.

"Trial and Error" is not the traditional courtroom trial movie in that it is not about a person wrongly accused.

"The defendant, Benny Gibbs, is clearly a con man, and everyone knows he's guilty of this crime," said Lynn. "We're not rooting for him to be acquitted. We're rooting for Richard to finally become somebody."

Ross was approached with the first draft of the script by his childhood friend Gregory Bernstein, who co-wrote the script with his wife Sara. Ross liked the premise of the script and immediately put it into development. Bernstein said, "most people believe lawyers are essentially actors anyway, putting on the ultimate show. We thought it would

be funny to take that to its natural extension and have a complete fraud enter a courtroom and go through the shenanigans of being a lawyer."

When Ross started searching for the perfect cast to bring "Trial and Error" off the page and onto the screen, Richards was the first to sign. "Michael is an amazingly talented and funny man," Ross said. "He's a true original, and he makes me laugh harder than anyone on television."

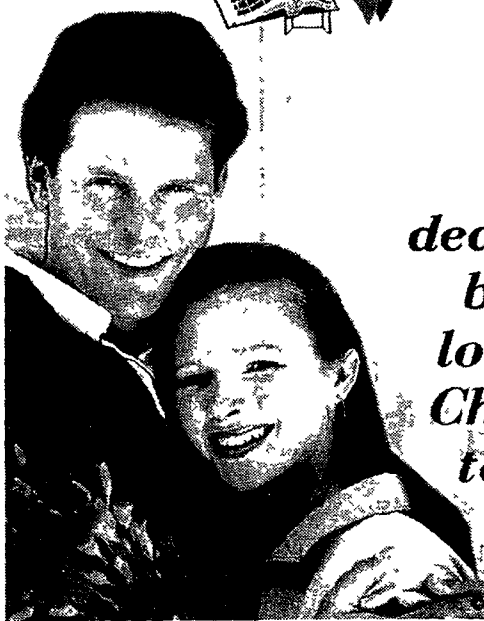
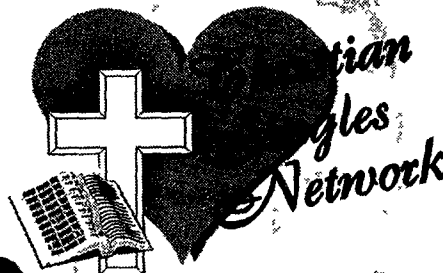

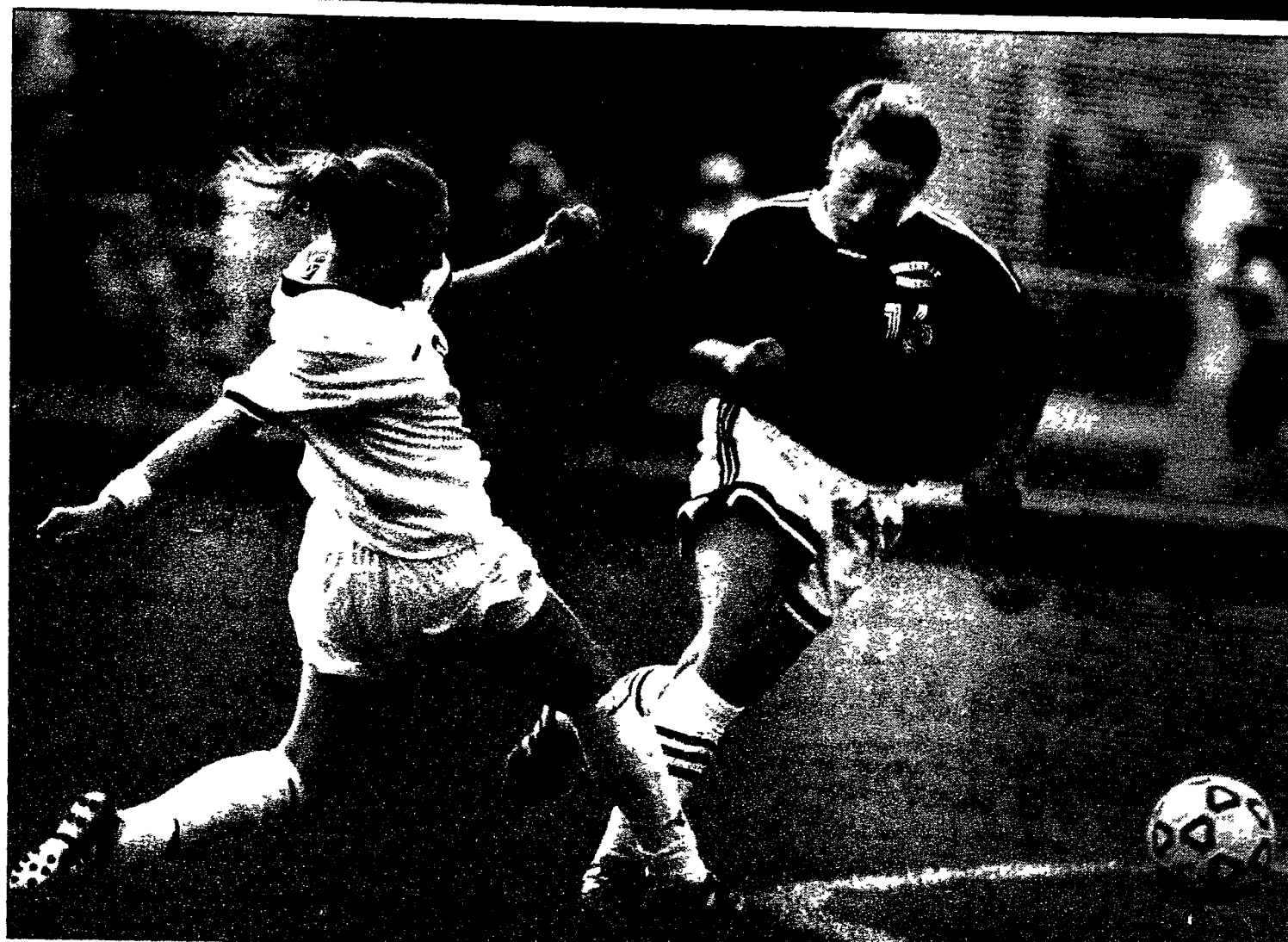

"I don't think our record indicates how good we are as a team," Baird said.

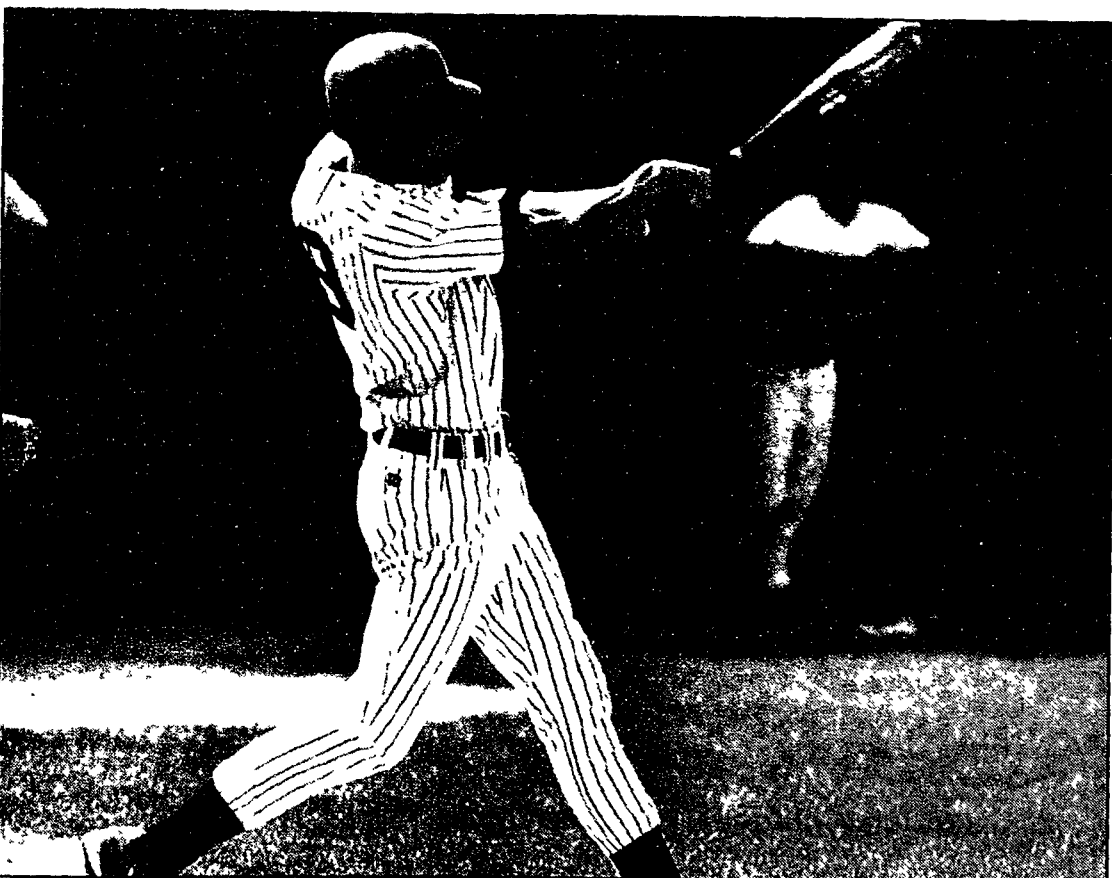

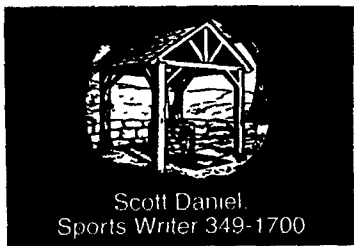

Fatigue syndrome affects millions

For those of you who know the pain and unending challenge of chronic fatigue, you know that trapped inside a body that doesn't function properly is a strong, healthy mind that would love to run, exercise and play, but often-times can't.

If you are one of the estimated 10 million people suffering from chronic fatigue syndrome, a real and serious medical condition that devastates lives and takes the "fun" out of living, you know what this feeling is. If you are not, but perhaps know someone or have a loved one with this condition, you might have thought many times, "If they would only exercise they would feel better."

Well, it's not that simple. According to Dr. Edward J. Conley D.O., the author of the new book, *America Exhausted*, and founder and director of the Fatigue Clinic of Michigan, the question asked most often in his office is how much should I exercise and what type of exercise should I do.

His basic answer to patients with severe fatigue and chronic fatigue syndrome is that,

first of all, exercise should not cause you to have post-exertional fatigue, meaning if you exercise and the next day you feel worse, you have overdone it.

"You must be very careful with aerobic exercise such as bike riding, walking, swimming, running or anything that raises the heart rate," Conley warns. The reason is that people with severe or chronic fatigue have difficulty generating energy for aerobic exercise due to a malfunctioning Krebs cycle, the system we use to generate energy aerobically. Therefore, aerobic exercise should be done with extreme caution.

What is the alternative for those trapped minds who need some form of exercise for peace of mind and to fight off depression?

Dr. Conley agrees that walking for pleasure instead of exercise is good for your spirits and improves your overall well being. You should start off very slowly and preferably every other day to allow your body some time to recover and rebuild its energy. For those people with fatigue problems that seem to improve with exercise, you can increase your aerobic exercise

more quickly but use caution and start off very carefully.

Dr. Conley also recommends that most patients tolerate anaerobic exercise, such as weight lifting, much better. Again he recommends starting off with very light weights, exercising every other day. This will help improve and maintain muscle strength, increase circulation to the muscle and increase the production of endorphins, our natural pain killing substance in the brain.

The key is to start slowly and only do what feels good. If you overdo it, you can be set back and have to start all over again. But with patience, time and good medical advice regarding exercise from a knowledgeable health care professional such as Dr. Conley or a facility that understands chronic fatigue syndrome, you can feel better and improve your quality of life.

AIDS sixth leading cause of death among young adults in America

As reported by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, by the end of 1994, 1,768 adolescents 13 to 19 had AIDS (resulting from HIV infection). These statistics do not take into account teens who had HIV but as yet displayed no symptoms.

Given the long period (6-10 years) between infection and the appearance of symptoms, the 1993 National Commission on AIDS suspects that almost 20 percent of all reported AIDS patients become infected during their teen years. Thus, the rate of HIV infection is higher than studies might reveal.

As of 1991, AIDS became the sixth leading cause of death among

young people 15 to 24, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

During the past 12 years, teenagers became infected mainly through tainted blood or blood products. Today, because of technical improvements in the blood-screening process, people rarely become infected through such treatment.

Recent studies indicate that the sharing of needles and syringes and having sex with an HIV-infected partner are now the most common ways teenagers become infected. Sexual activity between men now accounts for 30 percent of new cases, especially in older teens.

The potential for contracting

AIDS among teenagers is great. Many of them believe they are not at risk because, first, they feel invincible and, second, they see so few people their age who have AIDS. Also, many teenagers enjoy experimenting with alcohol, drugs and sex as common ways to assert their independence.

Some points to remember: HIV/AIDS is preventable. This disease cannot be transmitted through casual contact, i.e., handshaking, hugging, holding hands or dry kissing.

A person may look and feel healthy for six to eight years and at the same time be able to transmit the infection through risky behavior. The typical survival period for a person diagnosed with the

full-blown disease of AIDS is one and a half to two years. Very few people with AIDS live more than five years.

Unfortunately, others are affected when a teenager becomes infected with HIV/AIDS. Their families and friends are personally and emotionally involved as well. In addition to this, a baby can become infected during pregnancy or during the process of delivery.

A word of caution to any teenager who has a desire to experiment - remember all it takes is just one exposure to an infected person.

GARDENING

Growing Asparagus

Asparagus is a perennial and should have a permanent space in the garden. Using well drained, slightly acidic soil (pH 6.5 to 6.9) is the key. Work in rock phosphate or calcium phosphate at a rate of 5 pounds per 100 square feet of soil before planting. Each fall thereafter, 2 to 3 pounds of 5-4-3 fertilizer per 100 square foot of soil will keep the bed flourishing and vigorous.

Rows should be 18 inches apart in beds, or 4 to 6 feet apart if you want a path between rows. To plant, dig a 6- to 8-inch-deep trench one foot wide and place a shovelful of compost in the bottom every 15 to 18 inches. Set the crowns on these compost mounds with the roots fully spread out (not doubled over). Cover the crowns with a few inches of soil and compost mix, and leave the remainder of the soil from the trench heaped between the rows. As the ferns grow, gradually fill the trenches until the soil surface is level again.

Avoid covering the foliage at any point. New asparagus beds should be watered regularly unless there is ample rainfall.

It's best to limit the first-year harvest to only a couple of weeks. In later years it can be continued for four to six weeks, or until the spears start to decline in thickness to the diameter of a pencil. Harvest before the tips of the spears begin to open, either by cutting the spears on an angle at or just below soil level, or by grasping them at soil level and snapping them off with your hands.

Q. What is the best method for rotating food crops? I live in Zone 6 and do my planting in early spring.

A. There is one basic rule of crop rotation: Every time you plant a crop in a field or a certain garden bed, make sure it belongs to a different botanical family than was growing there before. This should be practiced every two years.

Another added insurance for crop rotation. Categorize plants as "roots," "leaves" or "fruits." Then each time you plant, change the family and the category. For example, don't follow a root with a root, a leafy crop with a leafy crop or a fruiting crop (string beans or tomato) with another fruiting crop.

Cover crops are an extremely important part of a rotation plan in hot-climate gardens because organic matter practically vanishes in light soils and high temperatures.

Keep in mind the longer you can keep the same family and plant type out of the same spot, the better.

Crop rotation breaks the continuing cycle of disease and pests that can occur when a particular plant type is placed repeatedly in the same spot. Rotation also varies the nutrient demands on your soil.

Of course, rotation can be as simple or as complicated as you like. Below are four guidelines to follow:

- Build the soil with a soil-improving cover crop.
- Follow the cover crop with a heavy feeder that's not in the same family.
- Follow that heavy feeder with a light feeder, also not from the same family.
- Repeat

The main vegetable families and their members are:

- **Crucifers.** Cabbage, broccoli, Brussels sprouts, cauliflower, kale, radishes.
- **Cucurbits.** Squash, melons, cucumbers, pumpkins.
- **Grains.** Oats, wheat, rye, corn.
- **Alliums.** Onions, leeks, garlic.
- **Nightshades.** Eggplant, tomatoes, potatoes, peppers.
- **Umbels.** Parsley, carrots, dill, fennel, parsnips, rutabagas.

If you can't change the family from season to season (for example, you may have a tiny garden and only grow tomatoes), change the variety, change the kind of mulch you use, the kind of cover crop you grow, and your methods of pest control. Always be sure to change something within the system every time you plant and your garden will thrive.

Q. Last year the berries on my raspberry plants had white spots on them as if someone spilled bleach on the fruits. What is my problem?

A. Your berries have the white dru-

The Virtues of Patience

Local gardening expert cautions that this year's cold, damp spring means a delayed planting time for many of the season's crops

Avid gardeners can't wait to put on their gloves in the spring but with the below-normal temperatures, many have contented themselves with browsing in greenhouses.

Those who have shown restraint will be better off in the long run.

"This season is unusually cold and damp," Glenda's Garden Center President Chris Cagle said. "People seem to be anxious to get out and plant."

Buying too early and keeping the flowers in the garage is not a good idea, according to Cagle. Getting it on sale only to store it away won't result in much savings if you'll have to replace it after a short time.

When planting time comes - and it will - some flowers and containers will become popular items at area greenhouses.

A new item for spring this year in the hanging plant category is a long tube which can be hung on a door, wall, fence, etc., or stood upright on a porch or deck. It can be used in either the shade or sun when planted with the appropriate cascading plants or uprights.

"I've always liked different things," Cagle said.

On the market for a few years is the flower pouch, a heavy duty plastic bag that is placed in a grapevine wreath and planted with cascading flowers.

New hybrid flowers such as proven winners come in many varieties, including ground cover, petunias, daisies, verbena and scaevola aemula.

"These are hybrids that have been modified to adapt to the consumer who isn't a master gardener," Cagle said.

Glenda's in Novi celebrated the grand opening of its new 10,000 square foot building recently. Located on five and a half acres, Glenda's has changed from the 2,800 square foot seasonal nursery it's had for 35 years to a year-round business which includes an all-season greenhouse and a florist.

The advantage to shopping at a garden center is the expertise of the master gardeners on staff, according to Cagle. The experts are there to ask questions about the care and placement of plants.

"With the amount of rain we've had, it's advisable to do soil

Eastlake chairs made in late 19th century

Q. Enclosed is a picture of one of four chairs that I have. There is burl trim across the top rail. A friend told me that they were made around 1875.

I would appreciate any information you can provide regarding where they were made, what period of furniture and their value.

A. The burl trim, incised carving, cane seat, side brackets, turned legs and front stretchers with central rings are typical of American Victorian Eastlake furniture. Your friend's opinion of the vintage is correct.

These side chairs were usually sold in sets of four to 12 and used in dining rooms or living rooms. Each chair would probably be worth about \$200.

Q. This mark is on the bottom of a porcelain demitasse cup and saucer shaped like four-leaf clovers. Each is decorated with a gold pattern against an Oriental red background. The inside of the cup is gold.

Could you tell me anything about the maker and value?

A. This mark was used by Coalport Porcelain Works, Coal-

port, England. They were founded in 1795 and presently are part of the Wedgwood Group.

Your cup and saucer were made around the turn of the century. The value would probably be about \$35 to \$55.

Q. After serving in World War I, my aunt brought a wooden parquet tray back from France. It is decorated with a scene of provincial cottages along the sea. In the lower left-hand corner is the signature "Galle."

What can you tell me about my tray?

A. Emile Galle, a French designer who formed his company in 1874, made glass, pottery and other decorative items.



ANTIQUES

Your tray was made around 1900. It would probably be worth about \$400.

Q. I have a wicker baby buggy in fairly good condition. It has metal wheels with rubber tires. The original upholstery is missing. There is a label with the words "Lloyd Loom Products of Menominee, MI. - Pat. Oct. 16, 1917."

I would appreciate any information you have on my buggy.

A. Lloyd Loom Products was a well-known manufacturer of wicker baby carriages. Marshall B. Lloyd was the inventor of a cost-effective loom that greatly improved production.

Progress can sometimes have adverse effects. Lloyd's loom that could do the work of 30 people contributed to the end of wicker furniture. The tight square lines didn't have the appeal of the Victorian hand-crafted designs. Popularity waned by the 1930s.

Your carriage would probably be worth about \$325 to \$375.

Q. I received a floor model RCA Victrola from a dear friend. It is the XVI model made by Victor Talking Machine Co., Camden, N.J.

The wood cabinet has doors that open to reveal the horns. There is a crank on the side. Included are the original Brunswick needles, 300 Ideal needles in a tin box, the original key, a leather booklet and a Victor record catalog. It's cool stuff!

I would never sell it, but would like to know its value.

enriching," Cagle said.

"When you have heavy soil, drainage is a key factor in being successful," he added.

In heavy soil, dig in sphagnum or peat moss or gypsum while planting. In sandy soil, Cagle recommends using bone meal with the moss because the nutrients tend to get washed away.

Use a triple 20 fertilizer once every other week throughout the summer.

"There are flowers that need that bloom enhancer," he said. "That's the type of information they should ask for when shopping at a garden center," Cagle added.

Although the floral carpet rose has been around for a few years, new this year is a

white variety.

"If you have a hard time with roses, these are almost carefree," Cagle said of the plant that is two and a half feet high by three feet wide. "They give a splash of color and it is not a high-maintenance rose."

Hybrid fruit trees are also becoming more popular.

"I see a lot of people wanting to get back into fruit trees," Cagle said. "Maybe mom and dad used to have one and they want to go back to the basics."

The new hybrid varieties are dwarfs that are self pollinating, bear more fruit and are more disease resistant.

"They're not like they were 10 or even five years ago," he said. "They are more user friendly."

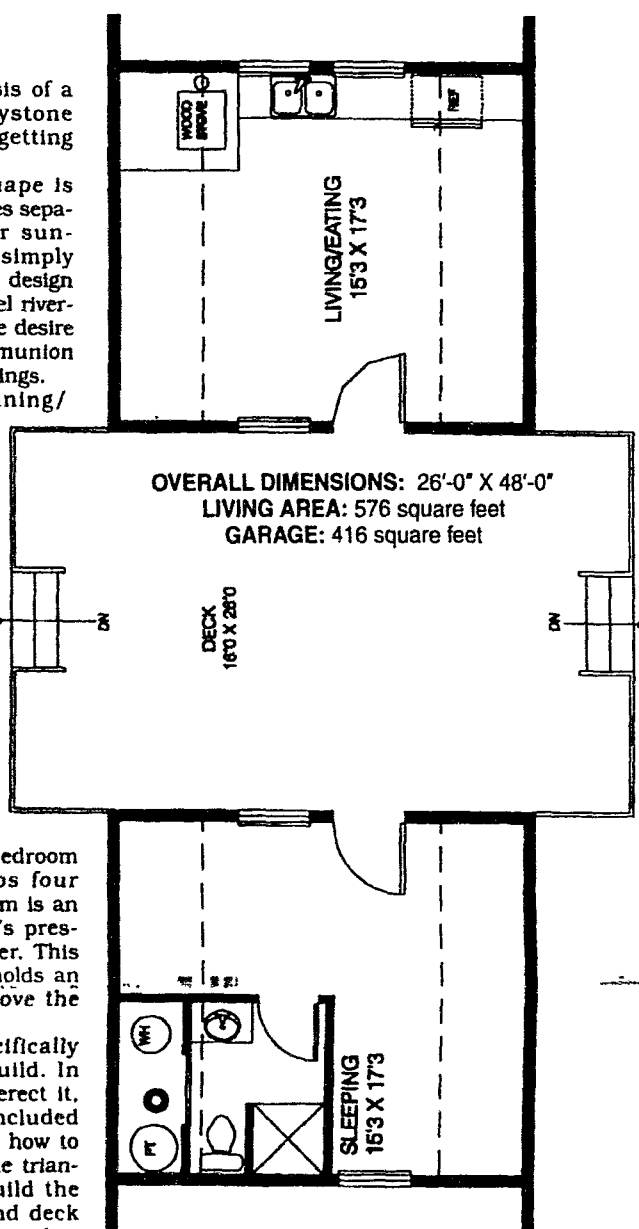
One finds space for a small refrigerator under the counter of this vacation home; a large storage loft covering the room can be reached by a ladder behind the door.

Illicit dealings can cost consumers:

Hidden payoffs and illegal kickbacks in real estate closing transactions are costing consumers a lot of money.

For example, certain lender-paid fees paid to mortgage brokers have been determined to be illegal "referral fees" under the Real Estate Settlement Procedures Act, according to a newsletter published by Real Estate Services Providers Council Inc. The ruling has shocked the mortgage industry and fueled a debate within industry trade associations over whether the law is outdated in today's marketplace.

Such payments have long been a standard practice in the wholesale mortgage industry. They represent the difference between a mortgage lender's wholesale price and the mortgage broker's retail quote to the borrower.

The key problem is often pegged to the structuring of those fees. They are often designed to steer new borrowers to higher-priced loans - types of loans the borrower doesn't really need and costing the borrower more than he should pay. That violates the act's anti-kickback prohibition.

Another problem is the vagueness of the act's regulations, which often confuse all parties involved in real estate transactions. An urgent plea has been expressed by mortgage industry groups for the Department of Housing and Urban Development to immediately issue a RESPA Policy Statement clarifying what constitutes illegal lender-paid fees to mortgage brokers.

While HUD currently requires that such fees be disclosed to the consumer, it has never provided specific guidance as to whether mortgage broker fees are allowed under the act.

"I cannot overstate the urgency of our industry's position," said Warren Lasko, executive vice president of Mortgage Bankers Association. "The very survival of large mortgage banking companies is at risk."

Another problem is the widespread practice of title insurance companies paying fees (kickbacks) to real estate brokers who refer their property-buying clients to them. This is clearly an illegal and unethical practice in most states, but those under-the-table payments are still frequently paid at points throughout the country.

The practice has weakened the public's perception of both industries. But pressure is building on perpetrators to abandon the practice. Brokers who engage in the practice could lose their license from their state department of real estate. And those agencies are becoming more aggressive in investigations.

In California, the state Association of Realtors is fighting the illegal practice by encouraging brokers and sales agents to report offenders to the Department of Real Estate. The association has also proposed a legislative bill that would criminalize such activity, beginning July 1, 1998.

It should be noted that some title insurance companies and real estate brokers abstain from such practices. They are usually leaders in efforts to eliminate the practice, thus leveling the competition playing field.

Q. Are home mortgage delinquencies increasing or decreasing?

A. After three consecutive quarterly declines in the mortgage delinquency

rate, it's now moving up a bit, according to the Mortgage Bankers Association.

A recent report shows the overall seasonally adjusted delinquency rate of home mortgages was 4.37 percent during the fourth quarter of 1996 - up slightly from the previous quarter.

"We expect these rates to hover near these levels over the next few quarters," said MBA President Ron McCord. "The rising growth in consumer debt, coupled with a moderating economy, could keep mortgage delinquencies from improving in the near future."

Q. Is the market for apartment properties in a slump?

A. No, the apartment market is in a healthy, growing mode. Despite some reports that this sector of the market is losing steam, apartment properties are increasingly popular with investors.

These properties attracted about 18 percent of the value of all property acquisitions last year. High-quality apartments appreciated (increased) nearly 9 percent during the past year, more than any other property category except suburban offices.

The future prospects for the apartment sector is a mixed bag, according to a Gallen Associates report. This was the first property sector to recover nationwide after the recession. While a number of major markets, particularly on the West Coast, could continue to experience double-digit annual increases in prices and rents, other markets will become at least moderately oversupplied this year, Gallen predicts.

Preventing raspberries from getting 'sunburned'

pelet disorder, a nasty sounding name for sunburn. The bleaching of the top berries is a result of solar injury that occurs when the temperature of the berry's surface rises above 100 degrees for a few hours during the two-week ripening period. Although it's common on red raspberries, it's only a cosmetic problem and the fruits are OK for eating or processing.

I suggest adding a shade cloth during the ripening period, it may reduce the damage by cooling the berries.

You may want to plant black, purple, yellow or newer red raspberry varieties such as Titan and Ruby, which are less susceptible to sunburn.

Q. I have a Jackmanii clematis that bloomed profusely for many years until last spring. Instead of the usual beautiful purple flowers, it had white and lavender striped flowers with small curly, distorted petals. What do you suppose happened?

A. I think your original plant dropped some seeds. Those seeds simply germinated into a new plant that grew up and obscured the original plant - which by now needs some pruning to bring back the kind of flowers you are used to seeing. Trying to grow clematis from seed is almost impossible, but once in awhile nature takes over and a seedling develops. Most of these "volunteers" have strange characteristics and

the curling you describe is no doubt a trait of the new plant. So locate the new plant and pull it up.

To get your original clematis to bloom, simply prune the lateral branches back to just above the second leaf node from the main vine, because clematis plants become woody with age and often can't get nutrients to the ends of their branches. The best time to prune is in late winter or early spring before new growth begins.

Learn Latin!

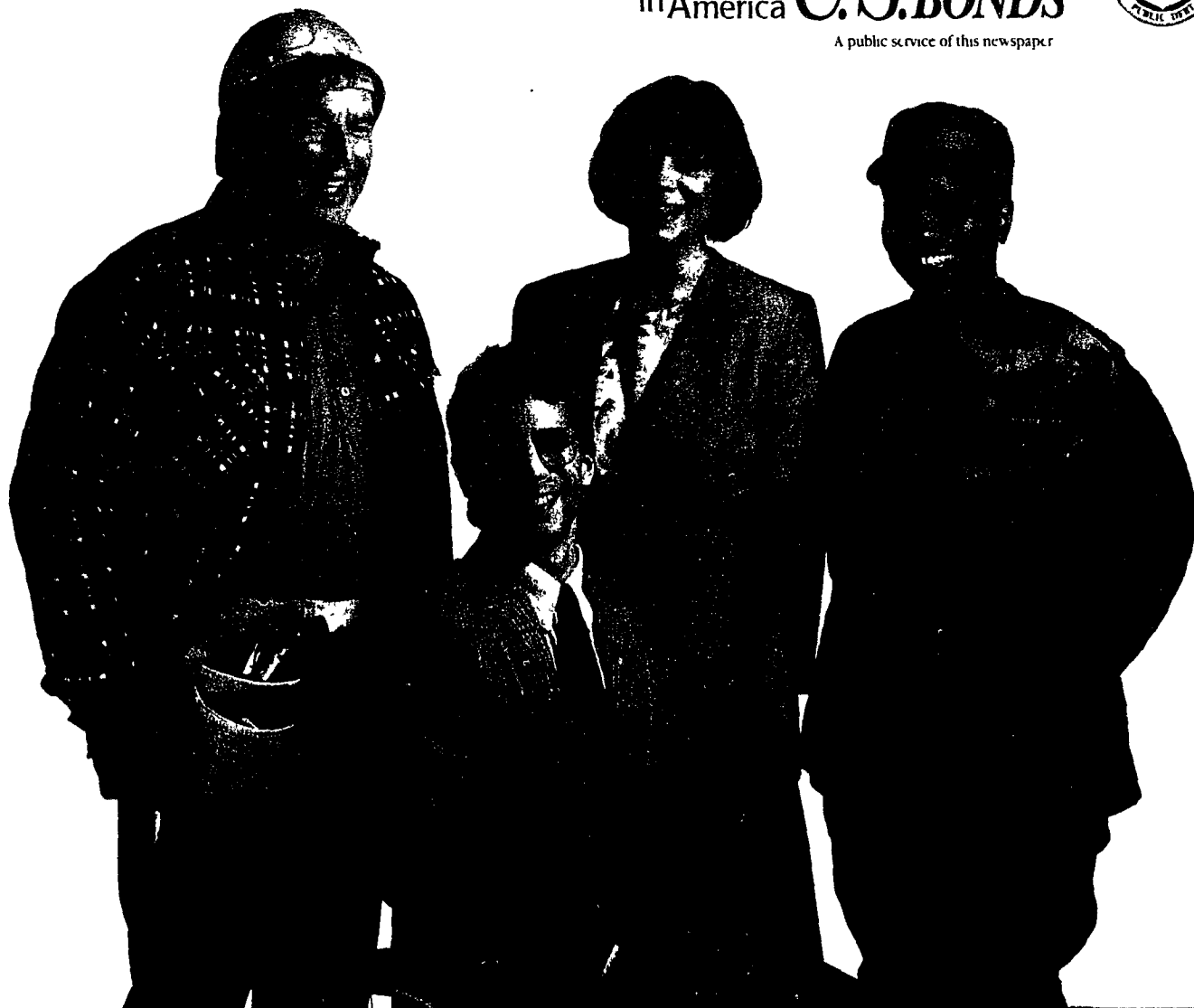

Mom, daughter team open new nail salon in New Hudson

Fathers and sons have gone into business together ever since Joseph taught Jesus carpentry. But mothers and daughters in business together is a newer phenomenon. Such is the case with 2 Thumbs Up, a nail salon that opened last month at 56901 Grand River in New Hudson.

Kerri Stevens and her mother, Glennie Kinder, had worked together at other nail salons, but it was Kerri who got antsy to start her own business. It had long been a goal for her.

"I'd been doing nails for a year, year-and-a-half, when I got a great offer for a shop and clientele and everything," she said.

She passed up the offer, and has regretted it ever since. "I like things my way. I do. That's when it gets done," she said, adding that a difficult attitude to have when you work for somebody else.

So she began looking in January for her own place. She checked out several spots, and passed by the former NAPA Auto Parts store in front of BKS Collision many times.

"I kept seeing nothing there but my reflection in the window," Kerri said. She checked with Bob Sheets, owner of the body shop,

and he was happy to sign them to the lease.

Mother and daughter went shoulder to shoulder to get the store in shape, plowing through years of dust and grime. A single ledge on one wall yielded two dustpans full of accumulated dirt. The bathroom could only be described as "a disaster." New flooring and fixtures spruced things up immensely.

They put in a burgundy carpet,

applied some white paint to the walls, and plugged all the holes in pegboards with drywall joint compound.

They got the key to the place on March 21, and within 12 days, despite the volume of remodeling work that needed to be done, and maintaining day jobs, Kerri and Glennie were ready to open.

Their performance in remodeling would have put the Big Three's just-in-time production lines to shame. At 1 p.m. on the day they opened, the 2 Thumbs Up sign arrived from Donner Signs in South Lyon and was hung above the door.

"New Hudson was where I wanted to be," Kerri said. "I started

doing nails in Wixom, and most of my clients were in Wixom and Walled Lake. Then I started working in South Lyon, and I picked up new clients there. New Hudson was just easiest."

According to Glennie, they've gotten great feedback, and even added some new customers.

"Some people might say, 'Oh, no, not another nail place,'" she said. "We haven't heard that. In fact we hear people say, 'Thank God you've

moved into the area."

Now that she can keep her own hours, Kerri now plans to take part in more nail competitions. She's competed on a small scale before and done quite well. Last year, she took first place at a Nailco-sponsored contest in Dearborn.

Shop hours are Tuesdays through Thursdays 9 a.m. to 7 p.m., Fridays 9 a.m. to 6 p.m., and Saturdays 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Call (248) 486-3682.
