Cops conduct decoy sting

Five people working in local businesses learned the hard way Friday night that checking ID is a must when it comes to cigarettes and booze, according to Northville Township police.

Township officers periodically spot check every establishment in the township which sells alcohol and tobacco, including restaurants and retail stores. Their method: send an underage decoys to try and buy.

The youth, in this case a 16-year-old male, carries proper identification and will present it if asked, township police Detective Fred Yankee said. None of the five businesses ticketed for selling the boy alcohol or cigarettes asked for ID, he said.

"We want to get the word out that if they have any questions, any at all, about someone's age that they don't sell to that person," Yankee said. "You can lose your license (to sell alcohol) and a whole lot more."

Like your money and even your freedom. Selling cigarettes to anyone under 18 or alcohol to anyone under 21 is a violation of local law, bringing a potential penalty of up to 90 days in jail and/or a \$500 fine.

Police sent the 16-year-old into more than a dozen township businesses. He was successful in obtaining tobacco or beer in five of them, according to Yankee, including:

- A pack of cigarettes at the Sunoco gas station at Five Mile and Haggerty.
- A 12-pack of beer at the Arbor

Manager axed

Top township administrator let go after less than half year on job

Northville Township Manager Dawn Flynn was abruptly fired Friday afternoon, but members of the Northville Township Board of Trustees won't say why - at least not yet.

Hired in January, Flynn wasn't even on the job for six months before Supervisor Karen Woodside informed her on June 27 that "the employment relationship with the township has been severed."

Woodside and Township Clerk Sue Hillebrand declined this week to explain the reasons behind the action. They cited pending discussions among Flynn, township officials and the township's attorney as the reason why they must decline comment.

Both promised on Tuesday, however, to discuss the issue once those talks are complete.

The township's charter gives

Woodside the authority to hire and fire non-unionized personnel. She and Hillebrand said, however,

er, that all members of the board of trustees were consulted and agreed with the decision to end Flynn's employment.

Neither official would use the word "fired" to describe what happened.

"The employment relationship has been severed," was Woodside's phrase of choice.

Throngs expected to show for fireworks

If you're coming to tomorrow night's fireworks, plan on coming early and staying late. If you're taking a rain check, plan on staying away from the roads on the western side of town altogether.

That's the word from the Northville Township police department, which has devised a plan to handle the traffic and parking congestion expect to hit the Six Mile/Napier Road area tomorrow evening, July 4.

A display of pyrotechnic pizzazz will cap Northville's Independence Day celebration. About 40,000 people attended last year's fireworks show, held on the grounds

of the Browning Ferris Industries (BFI) property near Six and Napier.

Big numbers are expected again this year, police Lt. Gary Batzloff said. His advice to people who plan to catch the fireworks?

"Get there early; the earlier the better," Batzloff said.

The fireworks will kick off at around 10 p.m. Only VIP guests will be allowed to view the display from the BFI site. Free parking/viewing areas will be available to the general public nearby.

Here's what you need to know if you're going to catch the show:

- Six Mile Road will be closed

Bookstall closing ends chapter for business district

All things, even the good ones, have to end sometime.

A downtown Northville tradition ends this week when Bookstall on the Main closes its doors for the final time. For almost two decades it was this community's only book shop, a streak which ended earlier this year.

For Berclay Ruschak, Bookstall's owner, it's a bit of a bittersweet moment. The hard work of running a business is over now but so is the satisfaction of a shop that's been a favorite among many downtown shoppers for years.

"It's a shame but it was time to reconsider priorities," Ruschak explained this past week as book lovers wandered the store's aisles dur-

ing a special closeout sale.

A lot of reasons went into her decision. Ruschak said, everything from wanting more time with the family to April's opening of the Barnes & Noble book "superstore" at Six Mile and Haggerty.

Bookstall is expected to close up shop as early as today, July 3. Once the last tasks are completed, Ruschak, a Northville resident for

the last 30 years, said she plans to enjoy some new-found free time doing everything from golfing to cooking.

"I might even get to read some of the books I've been finding for other people," she added with a chuckle.

Finding just the right book for any customer has been a Bookstall trademark and a personal touch that's won the store a lot of repeat business. Many loyal customers recently received personal thank-yous from Ruschak as she notified them of the shop's closing.

Bookstall on the Main is actually located at 101 N. Center Street. The name comes from the fact that the store started out on Main Street back in the late 1970s.

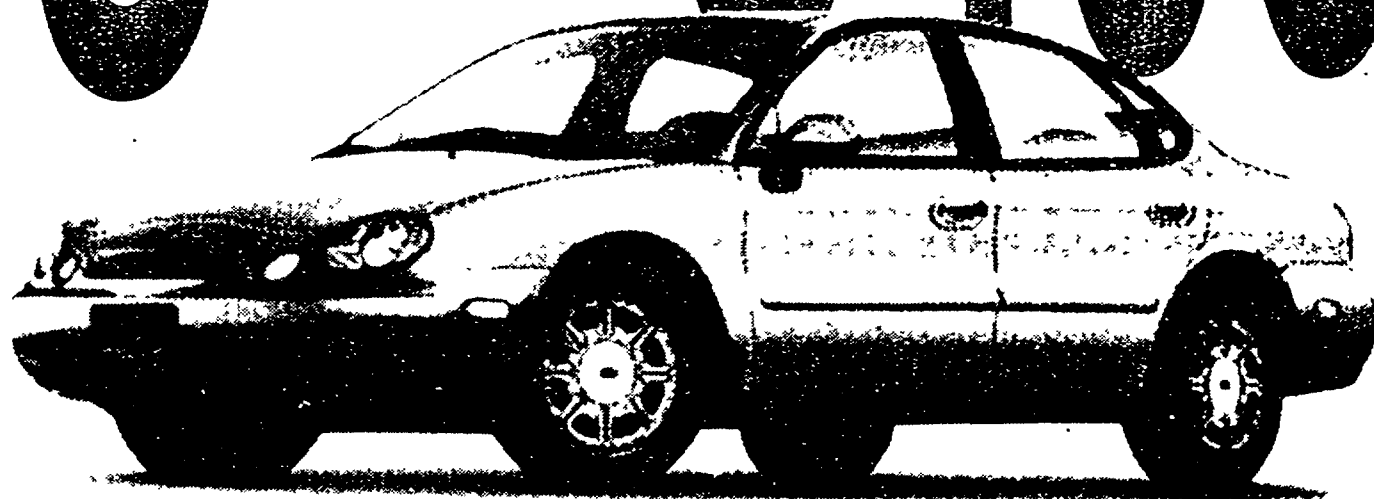

Friendship withstands falling out at auto shop

Most friendships have to survive stress points and tests of endurance, but few people experience anything like the ordeal Mark Erwin and Art Rott went through.

Erwin is a mechanic at Rott's Tuffy Auto Service Center on S. Northville Road, but he pushed his boss to the limit - and beyond - one day back in April.

"If you ask me, Mark just lost it and went ballistic," Rott said. "He threatened me. I had the police here to throw him out."

"But I know that, deep down, he's a good guy."

Erwin, who is under treatment for manic-depressive disorder, had a serious falling out with Rott and decided to take matters into his own hands. He spent one Saturday standing in the driveway of the Tuffy business waving large placards at motorists driving by.

Written on the signs were serious charges against the business, including claims that the owner deliberately overcharges customers and tolerates inferior work.

According to Erwin, several people acknowledged his message.

"People were beeping horns, waving and giving me the thumbs up," he said. "Saturday's normally really busy, but that day only a couple of cars came in."

Now fully over his bout of anger, Erwin is contrite and says he thinks he knows what really happened.

"I was taking four different medications, two of them to keep me up, two of them to keep me down," he said. "I've got a better doctor now, she's got me on only one type of medication."

Shortly after the episode, Erwin went to Rott with an apology and a request to get his old job back. During a tearful scene, Rott agreed, and now Erwin has nothing but praise for his employer.

"This is a really good place to work and Art's a good-hearted guy," he commented. "For him to accept my apology and give me my job back is more than I could ask for."

According to Rott, Erwin got angry when he couldn't get time off of work. Tensions escalated when he challenged a company policy dealing with employee responsibility.

While agreeing that Erwin was mostly at fault, Rott admits he too contributed to the bad feelings.

"I could have been more sensitive to his needs," he said. "He ticked me off and I ticked him off."

It wasn't just the problem of drug interaction that caused him to snap, Erwin maintains. A recovering alcoholic, Erwin has dealt with other recent traumas such as the loss of his father and the failure of his auto exhaust business in Plymouth.

The hardships built to a breaking point, he believes, and sent him over the edge.

"For a couple of weeks before that I was really touchy," he concedes.

Manic depression, also known as bipolar disorder, is characterized by wild behavior extremes. During manic episodes, patients become hyperactive, overconfident and excited to the point of irritability.

While depressed, sufferers often lose motivation and become despondent.

Dr. Paul Lessem, the education coordinator for psychiatry at Providence Hospital, says patients with manic depression have every hope

of leading normal lives.

"Manic depression is a treatable medical illness, just like diabetes," he remarked. "Regulation with medication is very important. People with the illness are able to lead

very successful lives."

There's no way of knowing to what extent Erwin's outburst might have impacted the Northville Tuffy business, but now that things are on an even keel again

Erwin wants prospective customers to know the truth.

"This is a good place," he said. "Art's a great boss and he insists on quality work. We do only the best."

Measure to limit imported refuse stalling in Michigan House

A Michigan Senate-passed bill to limit the importation of Toronto's trash to BFI's Washtenaw County landfill hit a constitutional snag in a House committee.

"We will work on this through the summer and come back in the fall," said Rep. Tom Alley, a member of the House Conservation Committee. "Sen. Bennett will work with this committee."

Sen. Loren Bennett, R-Canton, is sponsor of Senate Bills 4 and 5.

SB 4 would amend the Solid Waste Management Act to limit the importation of out-of-state waste, if permitted by federal law. It would apply to both waste haulers and landfill owners. The target is Browning Ferris Industries, owner of the Arbor Hills landfill at Six Mile and Napier. Metro Toronto

recently awarded it a multi-million contract.

In fiscal 1995-96 Michigan landfills accepted 42.4 million cubic yards of solid waste, including 5.7 million cubic yards from out-of-state.

The Arbor Hills landfill is located in Salem Township just over

Northville Township's western boundary. It will begin receiving trash from the city of Toronto in January 1998. The deliveries will continue for three to five years and include a half-million to one million cubic yards per year.

BFI is also discussing a deal to accept treated sewage from the

city of Windsor for a year to 15 months beginning this month.

SB 5 would amend the Hazardous Waste Management Act to require an offender to pay all costs of corrective action in addition to a fine of up to \$250,000 and two years in prison. A company could be fined up to \$1 million.

The constitutional problem centers around the fact that only the U.S. Congress may regulate interstate commerce. "Wisconsin had a clause that was found unconstitutional in both the state and federal courts," Alley said.

Bad check suspect wanted on warrant

A Detroit woman is headed to an Ohio jail after allegedly trying to cash a fake check in Northville Township last week.

Township police arrested the woman, 27, for forgery on the evening of June 25 at Home Depot. A cashier claimed that the woman tried to buy a \$185 telephone using a fake ID and fake checkbook. Both the identification and checks were in another person's name, according to police.

A computer check revealed an outstanding warrant for the woman's arrest in Lebanon, Ohio. She's wanted there for failing to appear in court on a second charge of forgery.

The woman was held overnight at police headquarters, then taken for a June 26 arraignment at 35th District Court in Plymouth. Judge John MacDonald entered a not guilty plea on her behalf and set bond on the charge at \$100. The woman is scheduled to appear in court on July 16 for a pretrial exam.

Whether she'll make it is an open question. The woman was turned over to the Wayne County Sheriff's Department after her arraignment. She's being held in the Wayne County Jail pending extradition to Ohio.

BACKHOE HEISTED: Police don't know how it happened but someone made off with a large backhoe from the site of the under-construction Ward Church near Six Mile and Haggerty last week.

The theft took place sometime between 3 p.m. on June 20 and 7 a.m. on June 21. A field supervisor of the construction site told police that the backhoe, valued at \$56,000, was dropped off that afternoon and parked next to the building.

It was missing the next morning, he said. Police have listed the backhoe as stolen in the area law enforcement computer network.

SHADES OF TYSON: A Garden City woman visiting Maybury State Park's petting farm got an unwelcome surprise last week.

The woman told police she was bitten by a horse during the June

25 visit. The bite was in the face and required stitches, according to police. The woman said she did not want to file a formal police report but informed law enforcement of the incident out of concern for future visitors.

CREDIT SCAM: An Eddington Place woman has been the victim of a credit card fraud.

The woman told police that she took a call last week from Northland Mall. Two fake credit card accounts had been opened in her name. A fake address in Detroit was listed on the application. One was used to charge \$1,800 in merchandise. The other was used to gain an unspecified amount of gift certificates.

The woman works at Hudson's in Twelve Oaks mall in Novi and told police that her purse is left in an unsecured area. Nothing is missing from it, however.

Police are planning to investigate.

DRUNK DRIVER: "A couple" of drinks netted a Northville Township resident more than a couple of hours in jail on Friday night.

A police officer was driving near Six Mile and Northville Road at about 12:45 a.m. on June 27. He said he saw a 1996 Volkswagen Cabrio run the red light at the intersection and swerve within its own lane as he turned to follow.

When stopped, the driver of the car allegedly admitted to having at least two drinks that night. The man, 26, also displayed signs of intoxication, according to police.

He allegedly failed field sobriety tests and was taken into custody. Testing later at police headquarters allegedly showed the man to have a blood alcohol level of at least .14 percent, well above the legal limit of .10 percent.

The man was held until he sobered up and then released on bond pending a July 3 hearing in 35th District Court.

That's how she found Bookstall in 1985, the year she decided to

buy it.

"I've always loved to read, even as a kid, and it just seemed like a perfect time in my life to do it," Ruschak said.

The store moved to its present location at the corner of Main and Center in 1992. The storefront will

soon have a new occupant: the Dancing Eye Art Gallery, now located just a few doors up North Center Street.

Ruschak said she hopes Northville shoppers will continue to support downtown as a valuable part of the city's unique charm.

Cooke Middle School instructors named U. S. WEST grant recipients

Two Northville educators were among 11 teachers in the Midwest who were awarded technology grants valued at \$66,000 by MediaOne, the domestic cable arm of U.S. WEST Media Group and the U.S. west Foundation.

Teachers Laurie Convery (English/social studies), Ray Balutowicz (math/science) and Principal Dr. Jeffrey Radwanski, all of Cooke Middle School, were named as winners.

The Connecting Teachers Through Technology grants will assist teachers at schools in MediaOne service areas in developing and implementing technology-based projects in their classrooms.

Teams of educators, composed of several classroom teachers, parents and members of the business community, will receive a check for \$8,000 and laptop computers for each team member.

In addition to the funding and equipment, the educators will receive two days of training in Internet technologies and applications this summer in Denver, the corporate home of U.S. WEST.

The winning project from Cooke Middle School involves students working in cooperative teams to develop, produce, advertise, and sell their own products. The interdisciplinary project will use com-

puter technology, such as spreadsheets, graphics presentation software, and Internet data bases in the manufacture, finance, and sale of their products.

The U.S. WEST Foundation is one of the largest corporate foundations in the United States. It manages charitable contributions for grant making programs on behalf of U.S. WEST Inc. and its family of companies.

In 1996, U.S. WEST Foundation disbursed \$25 million, much of it for programs using communications technology to improve education, small business development and community life.

Mega theater project slowed?

Developer Gary Jonna, spokesman for the planned \$30 million Pentagon Centre Entertainment Campus, said site development for the 20-screen theater is progressing and construction is under way on one of two restaurants planned for the complex.

The site is on Haggerty Road in Livonia, just east of the boundary with Northville Township.

Last summer, following the Livonia City Council's approval of the controversial theater proposal, Jonna said he expected an August 1997 theater completion date.

John Nagy, Livonia planning director, is surprised that ground hasn't been broken for the 20-screen theater, and permits for it had not been obtained as of last week.

"We thought it would have been under way by now," Nagy said.

Jonna responded to inquiries about delays by saying, "We haven't had any project setbacks."

Designed as the Pentagon Centre's focal point, the 20-screen theater will have 4,056 seats in auditoriums ranging from 129 to approximately 500 seats.

AMC Entertainment has promised state-of-the-art projection and sound equipment, plush seating, a roomy lobby, numerous concession stands and a wide range of movies - and movie starting times - to choose from.

The most recent development in the Pentagon plan was the site-plan approval by the Livonia Planning Commission of a six-story, 128-room AmeriSuites Hotel. Nagy said the next step will be for the hotel plan to appear on the council agenda.

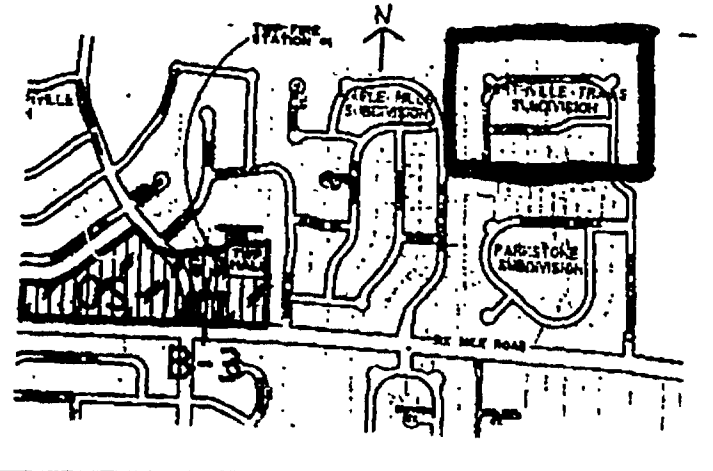

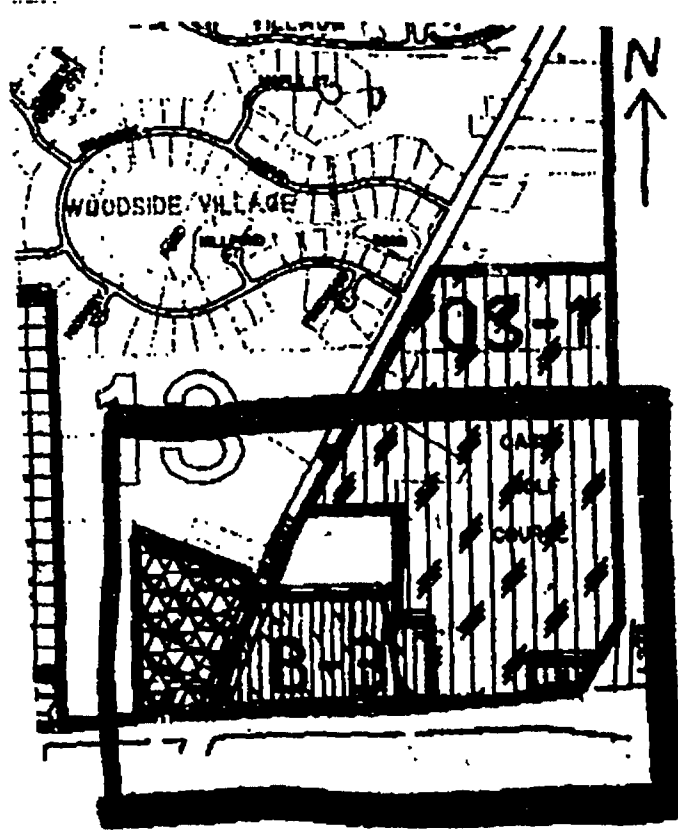

Camp 9-1-1 scheduled

What do you do when a friend falls and puts a hand through a glass window, getting a deep cut? How do you get out of the house if there's a fire?

Questions like these leave a lot of us uncertain, grownups and kids alike. Your children don't have to stay in the dark any longer, however, thanks to a special summer program from the Northville Township fire department.

Parents, if you're looking for a fun way to teach your kids the ABCs of safety, consider enrolling them in Camp 9-1-1. It's a free two-day course open to boys and girls ages 10-13.

There will be two sessions of Camp 9-1-1: July 24-25 and August 25-26. You don't have to be a township resident or even live in Northville to participate.

You have to register, however, and you can do so by calling the fire department at 348-5807. Space is limited to 24 youths per session, so call now if you're interested.

Be sure to pack a lunch each day for your child. The kids are sure going to need the energy - Camp 9-1-1 is chock full of fun and educational activities, according to the fire department's Sgt. Guy Balok.

"The kids learn things that can help them in an emergency. It's a really far-reaching thing," he said.

Here are some of the lessons included in Camp 9-1-1:

- Basic first aid, including helping people who are choking or bleeding.
- CPR training.
- The right way to call 9-1-1, including a rundown of the

information you should have ready to pass along to police and fire personnel.

- Pedestrian and bicycle safety, including helmets use.

- What to do during a house fire, including a trip through the Fire Safety House, a unique mock "home" which simulates the smoke and confusion of a real house fire.

- Identifying and eliminating home hazards such as bunk beds without bars or electrical cords that are tripping dangers.

- The kids can even learn more about jobs in the firefighting and emergency medical services fields, as well as ask questions of the people who do it everyday.

- The culmination of Camp 9-1-1 is a special "obstacle course" designed to test the skills the kids have picked up. Campers stop at stations along the course to perform safety activities such as correctly fastening a seat belt or administering first aid to someone with a simulated cut.

Every boy and girl who completes the course gets a first aid kit to take home. The fire department is looking for corporate sponsors to donate other prizes such as food coupons or safety gear like smoke detectors and bike helmets. If you're interested call Balok at 348-5807.

This is the second year for Camp 9-1-1, which is cosponsored by SWM Systems, the Lower Peninsula's regional emergency medical services coordination agency. Providing funding for staff training and camp materials are the Michigan Office of Highway Traffic Safety and the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

Cassis urges action on road study

Rep wants review of two I-96 interchanges

Start burning up the phone lines and fax machines between here and Lansing, State Rep. Nancy Cassis, R-Nowi, is asking area residents.

Cassis recently sponsored an amendment to the Michigan Department of Transportation's budget calling for a \$9.910 million design study for the Wixom Road and Beck Road Interstate 96 interchanges. No improvements can be done to the interchanges until the design study is completed.

A state House/Senate conference committee is now cutting and pasting the state's \$2 billion 1997-1998 transportation budget bill and Cassis said she is concerned the study will be pulled out. After the conference committee completes its revisions, the budget returns to the state House and senate for final approval.

She's urging people directly affected by the road conditions to have their say.

"I think the best thing will be to get on the phone. We've got to get this from the back burner to the

front of the radar screen," she said.

"The time is now. The window is open. We want to ensure this will pass."

Rebuilding both interchanges, as well as upgrading adjacent surface roads, is expected to be a \$90-\$100 million project.

To Cassis, the work should have been done "yesterday."

She's already contacted government leaders and chambers of commerce in Novi, Walled Lake and Wixom, asking that they throw their weight behind her amendment.

While many drivers find the two interchanges inadequate and unsafe today, growth in the area will not help the matter. Ford Motor Co. in Wixom is planning an expansion. In Novi, Providence Park will continue to add to its medical facility and also plans a shopping center across the street.

"This is important in terms of the overall projects that are out there and still coming in down the line, as well as what is already there," Cassis said.

"I don't think there are any more

higher priorities. I've known about this for years and years and years."

While the committee could make its decision as soon as today, Cassis said there still may be time to call or fax members.

Since her days on the Novi City Council, Cassis has followed the progress of a local consortium, including city officials from Novi and Wixom and businesses such as Providence Hospital, that's pushing for improvements to the interchanges.

"There isn't a single person who lives in the area that isn't very much aware of the needs at Wixom and Beck roads," she said.

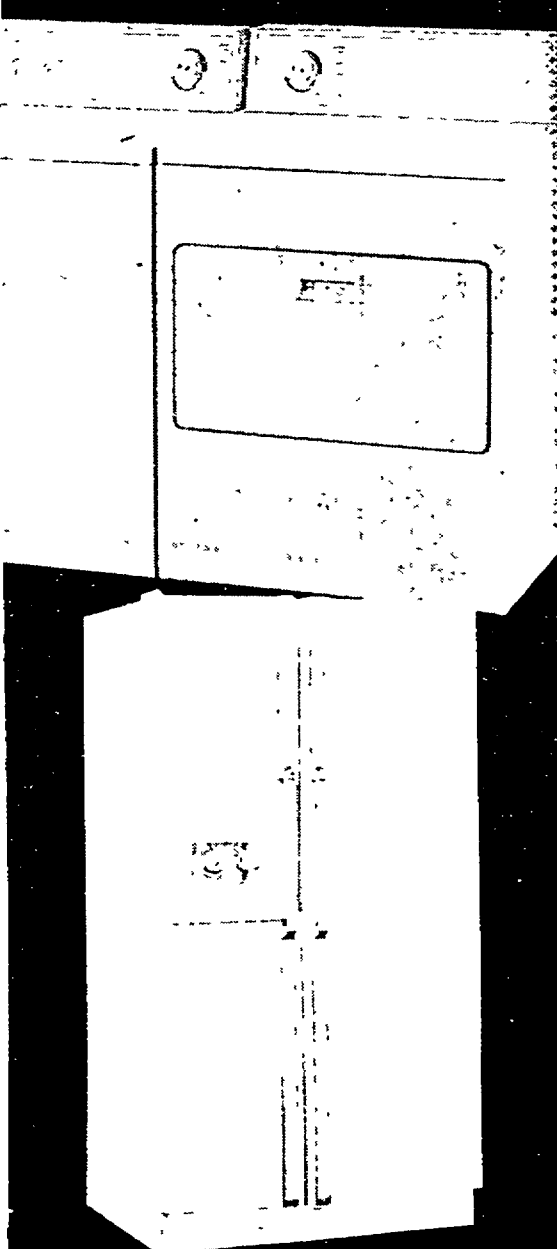

between Ridge and Salem Road for the evening. Only residents who live off roads in the immediate area will be allowed through.

Police will be on duty in the area starting at 6:30 p.m. to direct traffic to designated parking areas on Five Mile, Six Mile and Napier roads. They strongly advise arriving by 8 p.m. at the latest.

You're encouraged to watch the show from your car. The launch site is on top of a high hill on the

BFI grounds, affording a good view from any of the parking areas.

Once you're at the parking it won't be easy to get out so bringing water, rain gear and the like is a good idea.

Only a few parking spots are available at Northville Community Park on Beck Road between Five and Six Mile. Police suggest you avoid it.

Cars coming to the site on roads north of Six Mile will be directed to a parking area near Six and Napier. Cars coming to the

site on Six Mile and roads to the south will be directed to parking areas on Five Mile and on Napier.

If necessary, police will direct cars to park directly on Six Mile.

All roads in the area will be closed about 10-15 minutes before the fireworks begin.

If you're planning to attend a special pre-fireworks concert at the Northville Community Park which begins around 7 p.m., you can park on the grounds of the Optical Imaging Systems (OIS) building at Five Mile and Beck.

Still room for more pets in parade

You can still get in on one of the best parts of July Fourth: the pet parade.

It's an annual classic that everyone's invited to join. The pet parade takes place as part of the regular July Fourth parade through downtown Northville.

If you'd like to participate, bring your pet to the east gate of Northville Downs' parking lot off Center Street tomorrow morning,

July 4. The parade starts at 10 a.m. but pet parade organizer Russ Fogg hopes to start the animals off early in order to avoid the heat of the day.

Be sure to bring a container of water and the necessary equipment to clean up any accidents. Something to provide shade for your pet is a good idea as well.

Several special groups are taking part in the pet parade this

year. The Michigan Anti-Cruelty Society is one, a Detroit police K-9 dog unit is another, and a K-9 unit from the Western Wayne County SWAT team is yet a third.

In addition, a special in-line dance group will bring its dogs, and a dog rescue group, an adoption group and a drill team from the Huron Valley Humane Society will participate. For more information call Fogg at 349-6656.

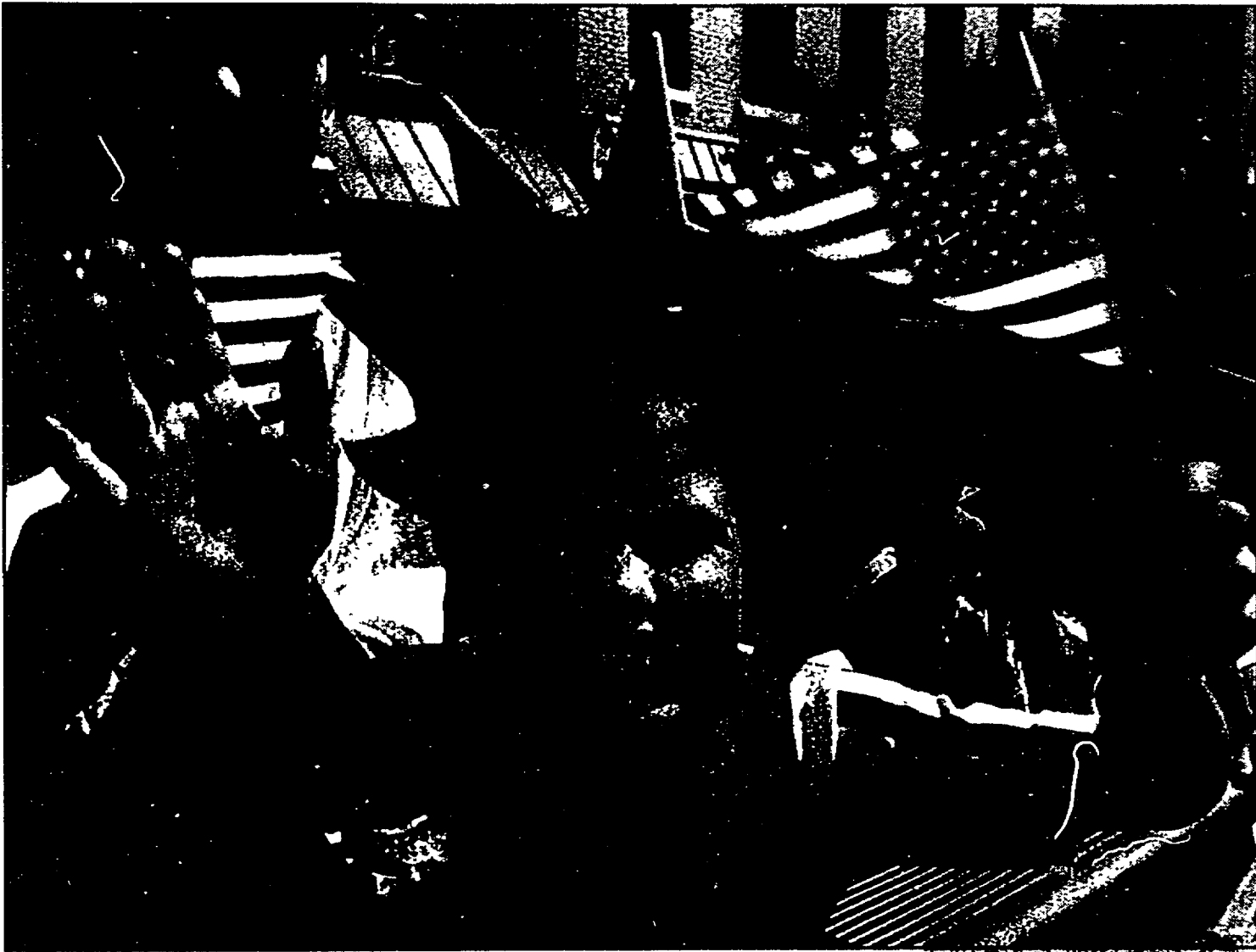

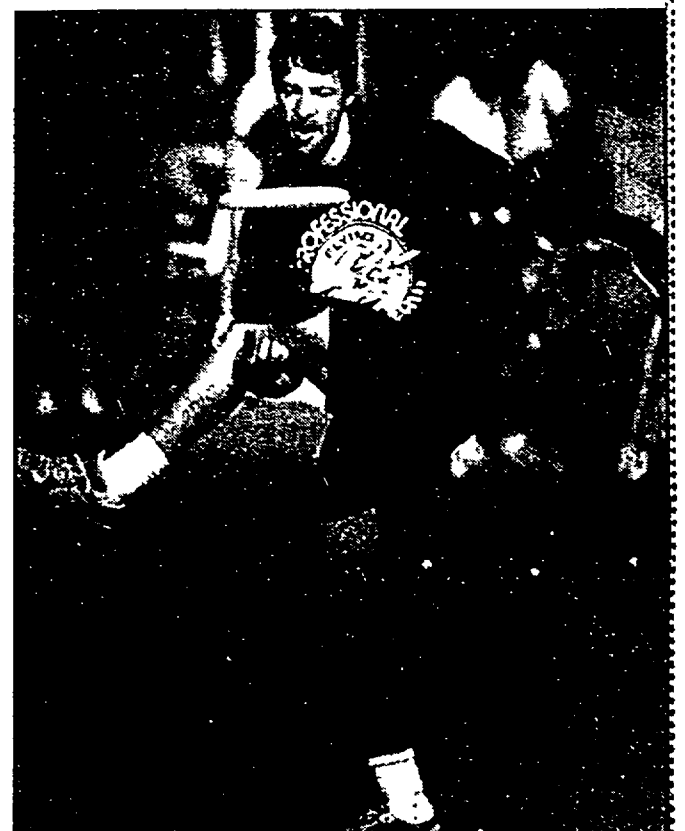

talk about their favorite pastime: for example, "hams" help to maintain a national network of broadcasters whose assistance is invaluable in emergency situations and natural disasters.

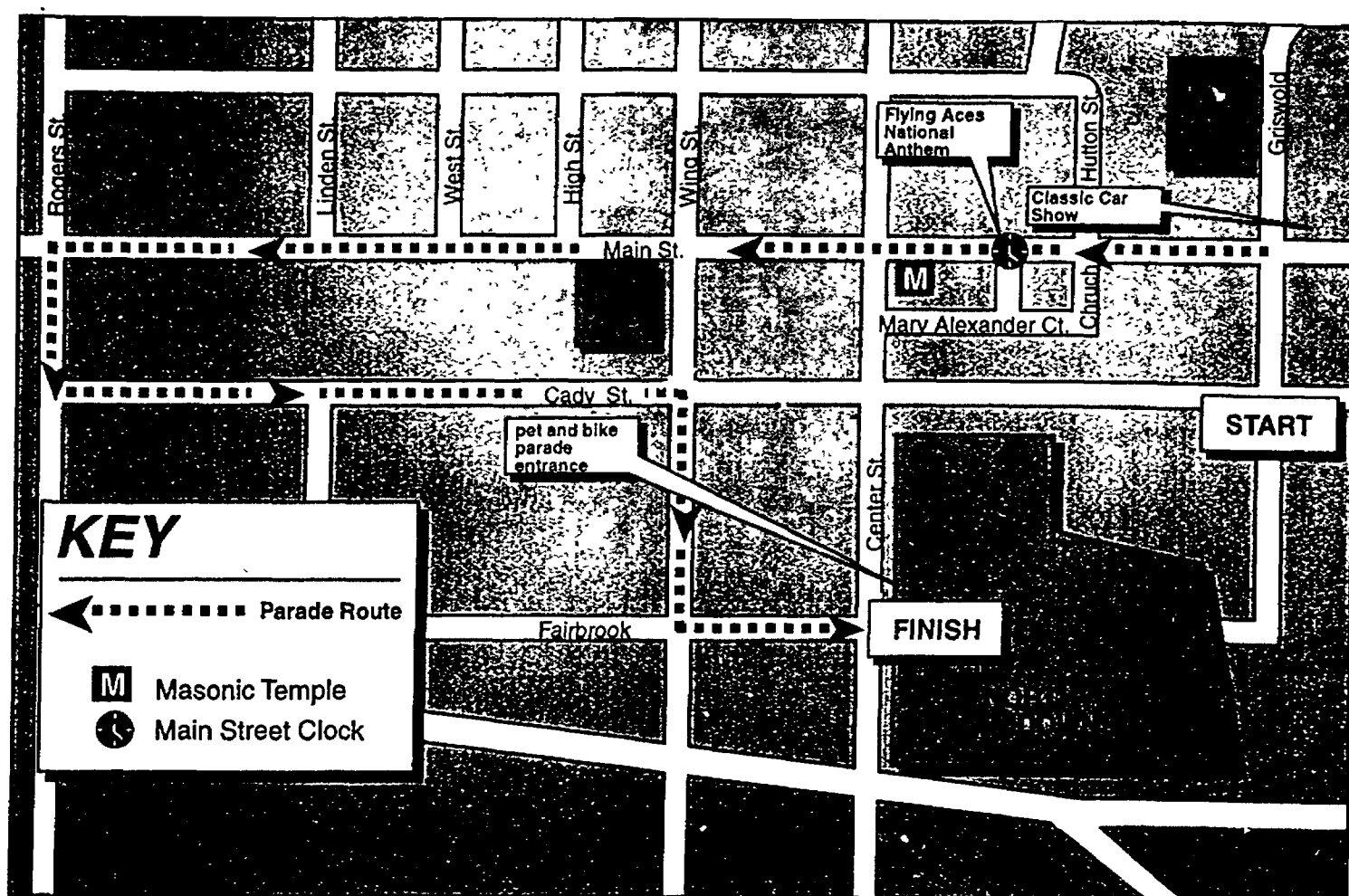
They'll be glad to answer your questions and some people who visit the Stu Rockafellow area may even be invited to step up to the microphone and talk to other "hams" across the U.S.A.

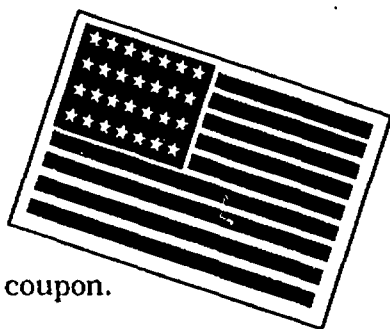

Show will be comparable to Detroit River display

Thousand explosives ready for launching at BFI site

Northville's fireworks display tomorrow night will be almost identical to the one that wowed the crowds in downtown Detroit last week.

About 1,000 pyrotechnic shells will be shot off from the top of the hill on the Browning Ferris Industries (BFI) property near Six Mile and Napier on Independence Day evening. They'll explode into every color and pattern imaginable.

"This is going to be one of the nicest and one of the biggest shows in the area," Joe LaVerdi said.

You may not recognize the name but you know his work. For more than a decade he's been the guy handling Northville's July 4 fireworks festivities.

LaVerdi, in fact, even did the shows back when they were held on the field near Northville High School.

He's the local representative of Zambelli International, one of the

largest pyrotechnic companies in the United States.

Their work includes the June 25 Renaissance fireworks display which attracted more than 1 million visitors to the shores of the Detroit River on both the American and Canadian sides. Northville's display will use almost exactly the same number and types of shells, LaVerdi said.

"The only difference is that the biggest shell they used was a 16-inch shell. We're only using a 12-inch shell here," he explained.

Fireworks shells will be fired from mortar pits dug into the BFI hill, LaVerdi explained, and will range in size from three inches to the foot long model.

A team of five people will shoot off about 400 shells during the body of the show and another 600 will explode during the fireworks' finale.

You don't go to school to learn how to handle high-explosive fireworks, explained Robert Turco, who works at Zambelli's headquar-

ters in New Castle, Penn.

"It's a highly technical process that was handed down from person to person over the years," he said.

Both he and LaVerdi began in the business when they were young, learning from the experts.

In business since 1893, Zambelli does about 2,000 fireworks shows each year, Turco said, using shells that can range in size from two to 100 pounds.

The displays are carefully choreographed and the shells are launched at specific times in specific orders. Different types of powders and packaging methods produce the variety of colors, shapes and types of fireworks we see in the sky.

Birthday was nearly July 2

Why is July 4 so special? Because it's a day that saw one of the most important events in the American Revolution—a milestone in the nation's struggle to break free from Great Britain and move towards autonomy.

Of course, we'd all be celebrating Independence Day a little earlier if the delegates to the Continental Congress in 1776 could have made up their minds a bit faster.

The representatives of the 13 British colonies in America actually voted on July 2 to declare their territories free and independent states. It took 48 hours of negotiations, however, for everyone to agree on the text of a formal document announcing the action.

Another seven years of fighting would follow. Finally, after losing at Yorktown in 1781, the British signed the Treaty of Paris in 1783, formally ending the war.

The last British troops left America from New York City that November.

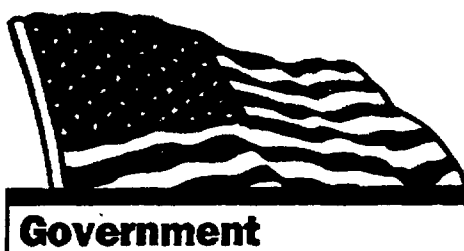
Officials must account for decision on manager

Apparently it's time again for a changing of the guard in Northville Township. After polling the other members of the township board of trustees, Supervisor Karen Woodside made the decision to terminate Township Manager Flynn on June 27. Under the township's charter, Woodside has the authority to dismiss at-will employees.

To date, we've been given little information regarding the reason behind the decision to let Flynn go. According to Woodside and Clerk Sue Hillebrand, we can expect to learn more once discussions with attorneys are complete. Presumably, talks are under way to provide some sort of termination agreement for Flynn and no one wants to upset the tenor of those negotiations with an ill-advised public statement.

Such hesitation is understandable and we're willing to be patient and wait for the discussions to run their course.

But our nervousness over this situation is also easy to understand. When Bill Richards was let go back in 1994, township officials were virtually mum about the failed professional relationship that began with so much promise.



We sense another potential stonewalling in the making.

We'd like to take this opportunity to remind elected officials whom they serve: Public office is not a license to reward your buddies and dispense with the people you don't like. Hiring decisions must be made to benefit your constituents, and the residents who elected you are always entitled to know why their servants are deemed suitable or unsuitable to work on their behalf.

Northville Township residents deserve an explanation about the Flynn situation. We trust that township officials will step up to their responsibility and offer an honest account of why they felt it necessary to make a change in this important post.

Fighting the fax war for roads

Republican Nancy Cassis is doing her job. As the state representative for this area, she's keenly aware that roads, especially the Beck and Wixom I-96 interchanges, are a top priority.

Cassis, who represents Oakland County Northville in the state House, has sponsored an amendment to the Michigan Department of Transportation's budget that would fund a \$9-\$10 million design study on those interchanges.

Her concern is that a House/Senate conference committee will pare her amendment from the state budget. Maybe that won't happen, but Cassis wants to take no chances.

So now it's time for local residents to do their part. Cassis is asking constituents who agree with her that the Beck and Wixom interchanges need improvements to fax or phone their opinions ASAP to the six members of the conference committee. Their numbers appear on page 9A of this edition.

Those people who think the freeway exits and entrances may be a touch unsafe and difficult to maneuver should make sure their voices are heard in Lansing. We can't vote for the lawmakers on the conference committee, but it's safe to assume that, like most politicians, they'll show some responsiveness to public opinion.

After all, we live in a 70-channel TV world where most folks see both spouses work and most families move three or four times over a decade or two. We all seem to be going in a million different directions every single day.

Rare frankness from a source

Most of the people reporters interview like to put their own spin on things. Whether it's a city official trying to downplay a controversial policy decision or a business owner wanting to sound optimistic about consumer spending, people always seem to bring their own agendas into on-the-record conversations.

That's one of the reasons for the celebrated skepticism of journalists.

But once in a while we're treated to a real breath of fresh air, someone who wants to tell a story and is willing to offer a candid account of it.

I came across such a rarity the other day when I talked to Art Rott and Mark Erwin over at the Tuffy Auto Center on Northville Road.

For those of you who might have skimmed over it, the unusual story of these two fellows appears elsewhere in this week's edition of *The Northville Record*.

Briefly, Mark, who suffers from manic depression, got mad at Art, his boss, and went off the deep end one day back in April.

Lashing out at his employer, he made up signs and picketed in front of the business for several hours on a Saturday afternoon.

The placards contained messages smearing the reputation of the business. Several motorists read the bitter words while driving by.

But, surprisingly, the two men buried the hatchet a short time later and Mark was rehired.

I learned about the episode when Art called me and asked if I would write it up for the newspaper.

Enter the skepticism referred to above.

"Ah ha," I thought to myself, "I know what's going on here. Employee tries to blow whistle on employer but the plan backfires and employee finds himself without a job. To get reinstated, employee agrees to do mea culpa routine in local press."

"These guys must think I was born yesterday," I snorted.

Happily, my hunch turned out to be wrong.

Though Art might have been trying to use the newspaper to minimize the damage done to his business from the incident, he was obviously sincere in how he related what had happened.

So was Mark.

They were frank, for example, in disclosing Mark's illness. Even though manic depression is highly treatable and is nothing to be ashamed of, most people, I think, would have tried hard to avoid mentioning it.

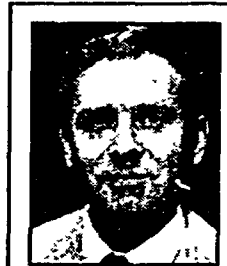
Mark was also forthcoming about his other problems, such as his participation in AA (four years now) and the failure of his Plymouth auto repair business.

Only another reporter, I believe, could appreciate the sense of relief I felt at hearing such details offered freely and openly absent any of the hard prodding normally needed to get people to talk. It's truly a pleasure to show up for an interview and have it all laid out for you without having to probe and plead for quality answers.

It's too bad the incident over at Tuffy had to happen. Some innocent people obviously got hurt. But, afterwards, it was handled with understanding, maturity and compassion.

I know more than a few city officials and business owners who could benefit from that same approach.

You'll find similar phonetic spellings on the cars of graduating seniors as they celebrate their rite-of-passage, advertising their misspellings for the whole world to see. No wonder taxpayers complain about what 12 years of education apparently produces. On the positive side, the students must have learned phonics somewhere.

The phonics versus whole language debate is always simmering. According to some critics, teachers are on a campaign to deprive students of phonics by imposing whole language on them. I wonder if these critics know what whole language is. I wonder if they remember what phonics was like. And I wonder if they know how slowly schools change.

I first endured phonics under the irritated and unsmiling gaze of Miss McKaye. After weeks of in-unison chanting through the alphabet, my classmates and I grunted and stammered our way through Dick and Jane's repetitive experiences: "Dick. See Dick. See Dick Run. Jane. See Jane. See Jane Run." Here the action picks up, sort of: "Baby. See Baby. See Baby Run. Run Baby Run."

I also remember Miss McKaye, her disposition considerably improved, inviting us to explore The Netherlands in a way that made a lasting impression on me. We built a huge windmill over the door, creating a fitting entrance into a classroom saturated with Dutch ambience. We carved wooden shoes out of P&G soap. We made tulips out of dyed eggshells and pipe cleaners. We wore traditional Dutch costumes for a presentation to our parents. She read to us and encouraged us to write and read stories about Holland, which

involved us further. The story about the Dutch boy's finger in the dike, for instance, inspired us to write "newspaper articles" as they may have appeared after the boy saved the day. Miss McKaye helped us with our vocabulary, our spelling, our love of language, as we tried to write the best newspaper articles possible for our parents.

We read and wrote, not because someone forced us to, but because we had a purpose: We were fascinated by Holland and we wanted to pass this information on to our parents in our skits, art and writing. It was pure fun.

My Holland studies affected me in ways I didn't understand at the time. I still find articles about Holland fascinating. I developed a fondness for the Dutch, their history, their battles against the sea. Even now, the scent of certain kinds of soap brings back vivid memories of carving those "wooden" shoes. I knew that one day I would visit The Netherlands, and I did. Miss McKaye was using "whole language" before there was a "whole language." She used what she knew worked.

Today teachers still use what works. They still say, "sound it out," and kids still grunt through oral reading.

Teachers know that students need a variety of work-attack skills which include such things as context clues, word shape and, yes, phonics.

But that isn't the only way to teach reading. Teachers today understand the importance of a broader approach which engages students mentally and emotionally. Teachers want to be successful, which means that they want students who love to read and write. They use what works best for them and for their students.

That involves phonics and whole language. Care for kauphy, anyone?

On April 17, an article appeared in *The Northville Record* that addressed a spring break trip taken by Northville High School students to Cancun, Mexico. I coordinated this trip through my travel business, Dream On Travel and Tour, and went on the trip myself acting not as a chaperone, but as a contact person in case of emergency.

According to the article, I was to be investigated by the Northville public schools' administration office for "inadvertently misrepresenting the school district." It was also stated by Dr. Rezmierski that the district would "vigorously investigate all reports of misbehavior."

My question to you is, what are the results of this investigation? Since the time of the April 17 article, I have learned that the information surrounding the Cancun trip came directly from the Northville High School administration office and was given to the board of education. It was the Northville public schools' administration office that contacted *The Northville Record* to run this story.

All the information given to *The Northville Record* was based on rumors. Many of the allegations printed were devastating to the students involved and their families, primarily because the allegations stated were simply not true.

Dr. Rezmierski also stated that: "(The allegations) concern me a great deal because the district always looks out for the well being of our students."

If this were true, why would the school district hand this information to *The Northville Record* instead of handling it in-house? The best interest of the students was obviously not the school district's priority.

To date, I have not been questioned about the spring break trip by anyone from Northville public schools. *The Northville Record* has been told by the administration office that the results of this investigation would be forthcoming, but Northville public schools has yet to provide *The Northville Record* with any findings of their investigation. They have, in fact, sidestepped the issue.

All investigations must have an end. Please make Northville public schools be responsible for their actions.

Only exceptional candidate can challenge Engler

Although the method of announcement (an exclusive interview given by Gov. John Engler's wife, Michelle, with the *Detroit Free Press*) was a tad unusual, the substance was no big surprise. Big John, the 800-pound gorilla of Michigan politics who was so staunch in support for tight term limits, wants a third term for himself.

His decision ends a long home stand of "speculation," the favorite spectator sport of Michigan political insiders.

Some figured Engler wouldn't run, citing the traditional difficulties in winning a third term and the Engler family's need to make some serious money in the private sector to put the triplets through college. Others argued running for stuff is what Engler loves (he has never lost an election).

Moreover, they said, without a strong governor on top, the Republican Party will tear itself to shreds.

Engler is obviously the heavy favorite for reelection next year, although if I were in charge of the family budget I wouldn't spend a lot of money redecorating the girls' rooms before Nov. 9, 1998. I saw enough of Jim Blanchard's attempt to win a third term in 1990 to know

that nothing is ever certain in politics, especially if you answer too quickly to the nickname "Pothole John."

All the same, none of the Democrats now running for nomination should feel all that happy now that the race has come quickly into focus.

A poll published two weeks ago in the newsletter *Inside Michigan Politics* suggested the Democratic nomination was still wide open, assuming neither Detroit Mayor Dennis Archer nor former U.S. Sen. Don Riegle gets in. None of the five likely candidates - James Agee, Jim Berryman, Larry Owen, Doug Ross and Karen Willard - has name recognition numbers above 31 percent.

Owen, so far dubbed the favorite by conventional wisdom, has a very slight and probably meaningless lead in name recognition. He also has a nearly even favorable-unfavorable (7 to 6 percent) rating split, probably stemming from his controversial tenure as a member of the Michigan State University governing board. That rating is now likely to suffer the consequences of his wife, Faylene, being fingered as a source for the rumors about the alleged difficulties in the Engler marriage.

Ross, on the other hand, has a 9 to 1 percent fav-unfav rating, reflecting his experience as a state senator, Blanchard's commerce director and assistant secretary of labor for employment and training.

More to the point, I believe, is the impact of Engler's announcement on the dynamics the Democratic primary.

Owen's strongest suit in winning nomination has always been his presumed support from organized labor, which nearly always picks Democratic nominees. But Engler has already shown that he can whip a weak Democratic candidate with strong union support (Howard Wolpe, in 1994). So, the analysis goes, one wonders just how far a labor-dominated Owen campaign would get against a still formidable Engler.

Ross, on the other hand, is making grassroots, citizen-based politics the core of his strategy. With \$500,000 raised and 2,400 volunteers signed on, Ross at his announcement two weeks ago told 800 supporters at Livonia's Burton Manor, "We are sending a signal to the old-style politicians who take their cues from the special interests: Step aside."

"(Cynics) say campaigns are all about special interest money and back-room deals and negative TV ads," Ross continued. "They say there's no place for real people or real ideas in campaigns any more. Do you believe that?"

To shouts of "no!" Ross said, "I didn't think so."

There's a long way to go till next November, and anything could happen.

But my guess as of now is that it'll take an unconventional campaign run by an unconventional, idea-driven politician to make Engler sweat the way he should in a close race.

State abortion rate lowest in almost 20 years

Abortions in Michigan have dropped more than 35 percent since 1980, the Department of Community Health reported.

"Wonderful news," Gov. John Engler said. "We are very proud that Michigan is a national leader in protecting the unborn."

James K. Haveman Jr., director of the Department of Community Health, credited "counseling and

increased communication" for the drop. He did not suggest any other reasons for the downturn.

In 1996, the state recorded 30,208 abortions, which by state law must be reported by physicians though without identifying the women. Of those women, 83 percent were unmarried.

The high year was 1980, when 45,455 abortions were performed. The number began dropping faster after 1988, when Michigan voters

prohibited the use of state funds for welfare abortions.

In later actions, the Michigan Legislature passed laws to require girls under age 18 to get either parental or probate court consent, and to require abortion providers to give women a lengthy checklist of facts ("informed consent").

Wayne County recorded 9,927 of all abortions in the state. Next was Oakland with 3,750, followed by Genesee with 1,630.

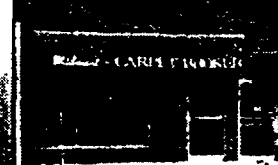

Flynn left Township Hall Friday afternoon and has not returned to work since. She signed a two-year employment contract five and a half months ago, the terms of which made her an "at-will" employee.

Legally speaking, that means that the township doesn't have to "show cause" or give reasons why they're dismissing Flynn.

A meeting between the ex-manager, township officials and the township's lawyer was set for yesterday afternoon, July 2. Hillebrand and Woodside declined to discuss what was on the agenda, but the supervisor did say that the question of severance pay is under review.

No plans have been made yet to hunt for a new township manager, according to Hillebrand. However, the board has formed a special committee to explore the idea of

eliminating the position altogether in favor of a full-time field of elected officials. That move was in the works before the Flynn situation arose, Hillebrand said.

Many smaller townships in Michigan favor a professional manager/part-time board form of government where the manager has the experience and authority to make important day-to-day decisions.

The idea is that in a small town the amount of work to be done in local government is light enough for one qualified professional administrator to supervise. As the township grows so does the workload, however, and some think that the system to get everything done should also expand.

Northville Township's experience with the manager system has hit its rocky spots in recent years. Flynn is the third manager to leave the township in under four years.

as Canton have made their elected officials' positions full-time, giving their occupants both more responsibility and more money. The thinking goes that many people who are otherwise qualified to serve as supervisor, clerk or treasurer don't run for those posts because they can't perform in the position and hold down a day job at the same time.

A full-time post, on the other hand, attracts a deeper pool of talent.

The special committee will take a look at different ideas, Hille-

brand said, including what other communities have done. The board of trustees would have the final say about any changes the group might recommend.

Hillebrand said that changes shouldn't go into effect until after the next board of trustees election, scheduled for November in the year 2000.

Flynn didn't return a phone call from *The Northville Record*. She was earning a salary of \$65,000 per year and the use of a township vehicle to travel to her job from her home in the Lansing area.

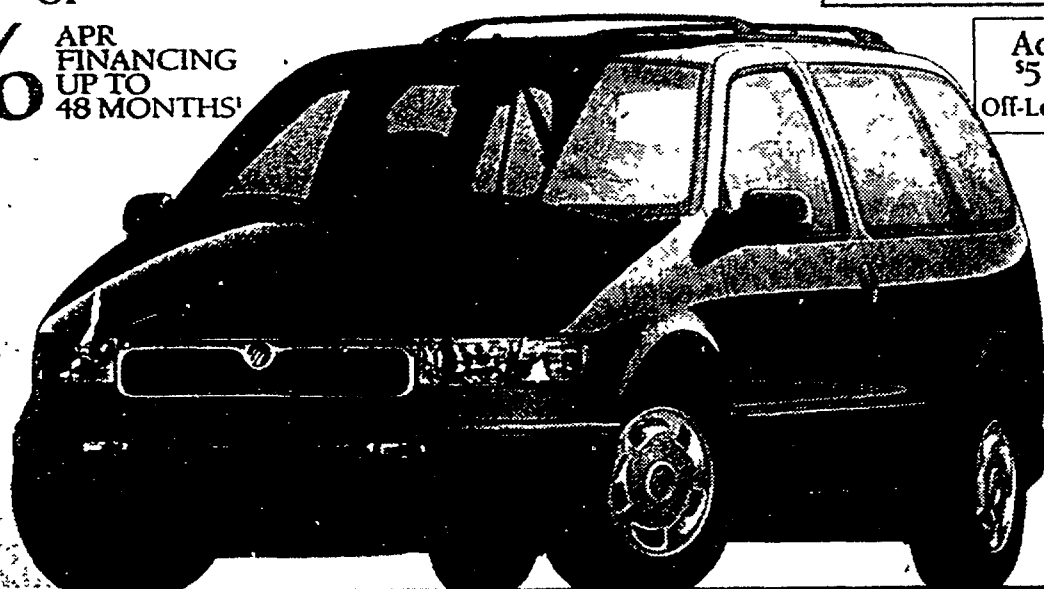

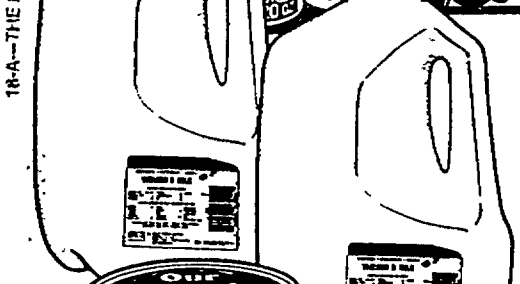

The GREEN Thumb CLUB

Watching the flowers grow is becoming the summer passtime at Whitehall Health Center of Novi, thanks to phase one of the renovation of the Center's courtyard.

Gardening was an activity enjoyed by many residents of Whitehall before they moved to the Center on Ten Mile Road.

Some have rediscovered their love of gardening with the help of activities director Kathy Israel.

After attending a horticultural therapy class at Michigan State University, Israel came back to Whitehall and sat down with administrator Becky Dutzy. They brainstormed ideas for reconstructing the garden so it could be better utilized.

"We felt it would be more beneficial to all," Israel said.

The MSU horticultural therapy seminar she attended included information about the correct tools to select, which are lighter

and easier for residents to use and about the height of raised beds.

In one corner at the end of the yard, a fountain which had been abandoned because it was hard for staff to keep clean was removed and a raised vegetable garden installed.

The raised bed is framed in landscape timbers. Fill dirt was brought in and eight inches of top soil was mixed with humus and organic material.

"Gardening releases stress and anxiety," said Israel, who is also a master gardener.

This year's crop includes three types of tomatoes, green peppers, cabbage, broccoli, Italian and chocolate peppers, parsley, yellow beans and squash.

"It gives them the feeling of importance," Israel said. "They are contributing something here and to the other residents."

Gardening also provides opportunities for residents to meet each other.

"It is reminiscent of gardens they have had in the past," she said. "Especially when they see the flowers coming up and smell the flowers."

Residents who found they had gardening in common were Maggie Felcyn, 88, and Joe Kowaleski, 74, who have become the garden's senior caretakers.

"They say gardeners are eternal optimists because they are always looking forward to what's going to happen next," Israel said.

Israel noticed Kowaleski in the yard one morning digging up the dandelions. He told her by the end of the day they'd all be gone.

Sure enough, using no pesticides, Kowaleski removed all 40 dandelions individually by hand then planted grass seed.

"I'm going to do a good job or I'm not going to do it," Kowaleski said. "There's a right way and a wrong way."

Right on schedule, after breakfast and dinner, unless the weather calls for rain, Kowaleski will journey to the garden to water the vegetables and flowers.

Before coming to Whitehall, Fel-

cyn had a small greenhouse at her home.

"I planted everything I fancied," she said.

The miniature roses she has received as gifts since moving to Whitehall are now thriving in the garden, along with other plants residents have been given such as Easter lilies, which also found a spot in the flower bed.

In the flower garden there are delphiniums, shasta daisies, snow on the mountain, poppies, irises and begonias.

"It's a very small scale operation but we like it," said Felcyn who feels busy when she's using her hands.

"Last year we had a few perennials but it has just blossomed and a lot of it is just TLC," Israel said of the flower bed.

Petunias now grow in three-foot tall cylindrical planters, which makes it easier for those in wheelchairs to tend.

Both Mildred Kimball and Dorothy Wolf remember when they had gardens in their own backyards.

"The residents look forward to watching the plants bloom," Israel said. "Maggie has blossomed this year."

Under the gazebo in the center of the garden there are picnic tables and lawn chairs. Last week's watermelon party was held outside.

"Now we try to do as much as we can outside," Israel said.

"It is a good family place." Community members also involved in the project include St. James Catholic Church in Novi: Ahwyne Bales; Ed Napierkowski; North Farmington Garden Club members Charlotte Fortier, Mary Lou Kotziars, Linda Orman and Norma Henderson; Northville resident Brian Skiba; and Grayes Greenhouse in Plymouth.

Staff members who lent a hand include Natalie Frever, Fran Sima and Murrell McQueen.

"We hope to keep adding more to it with the reconstruction and we're going to work on more therapeutic things and lighter tools," Israel said.

WHEELCHAIR GARDENING

Waist-high beds are ideal for wheelchair gardeners or those who need to sit while working.

The ideal size of the bed should be two feet high and no more than four feet wide and 10 feet long. A bed four feet wide requires a two-foot reach to get to the middle of the bed if you have access from all sides. If the bed is backed up to a wall, it should only be two feet deep.

Plant containers placed waist high, such as on a bench or table, will also work.

ADAPTIVE TOOLS

Enlarge small handles by wrapping them with soft fabric if you have trouble making a fist. Bicycle handle grips, tennis racket grip tape and rubber hand grips made for crutches can also be used.

A cup with a large handle can be used as a digging tool if you have weak fingers. The same type of cup can also be used to dip water from a bucket. A water-soaked sponge is ideal for dribbling water over plants.

Crutches and bicycle baskets can be attached to wheelchairs for carrying tools. A keyboard extender can be used for those with limited arm strength. To meet the needs of your individual abilities, consult with a physical therapist.

Long handled tools are available, including bulb planters, weed pullers, seed scoops, water nozzles and grass shears, which eliminate bending over in the garden.

To move tools and supplies around in the garden, there are lightweight carts. Four wheels offer more stability than two and some carts come with detachable sides for easier unloading.

Small watering cans are lighter than larger containers because they are narrower.

Shovel and trowel handles with "D" handles are easier to use than straight handles. Garden forks are easier on the back than shovels.

Shower caps or shower caps, which hang around the neck, make it easier to reach plants easier for those with limited arm strength.

'Batman & Robin' doesn't live up to potential

I guess I really didn't think "Batman and Robin" would live up to all the hype it's received. But if I didn't expect it to be the best movie ever made, I at least thought it would be watchable. I was wrong.

That's really a shame, considering all the money and talent that was poured into this movie.

The cast, headed by "ER" star George Clooney as Batman and Arnold Schwarzenegger as his nemesis Mr. Freeze, is a veritable who's who of the hottest talent in Hollywood. And the costumes are certainly dazzling (especially Schwarzenegger's suit of temperature-regulated armor).

But all that glitz is useless without a decent script, which seems to be the only area where the production team decided to save money.

Now, we know people don't go to Batman movies for the riveting storylines. All that's needed is a simple good vs. evil conflict, where some mutated villain attacks Gotham City, and faces the wrath of the Caped Crusader.

But for such a plot to work, there are two requirements: 1) The villains must be interesting and 2) the heroes must be endearing. It is here where the movie fails.

The movie essentially has two villains: Schwarzenegger's Mr. Freeze, a former scientist transformed into a human icicle by a freak accident, and Uma Thurman's Poison Ivy, another transformed scientist with the power to poison with her kiss. The characters have potential, but the script sells them short and they emerge as one-dimensional bores. The actors don't help.

Schwarzenegger is totally wrong for the role of Mr. Freeze, who is really just a mixed-up guy with some misdirected anger and a longing to resurrect his ill, cryogenically frozen wife. Sure, Schwarzenegger seems like an ideal choice to deliver lines like "Ok everybody — chill," but, on an emotional level, the performance is totally cold. He gives us little sense of the character's pain and vulnerability, and, thus, we have no reason to care what happens to him.

Thurman is more appropriately cast. She has played femme fatales before, but her vamping here lacks the zest of her performance in a film like, say, "Pulp Fiction." Granted, "Batman and Robin" director Joel Schumacher is no Quentin Tarantino, but Thurman is also a problem. She just seems to be phoning the performance in, borrowing a little from her "Fiction" character, and stealing the rest from Michelle Pfeiffer's Catwoman in "Batman Returns." She doesn't bring anything new to the role.

The film's heroes also leave something to be desired

— especially Clooney as Bruce Wayne/Batman. Granted, in these movies, Batman is often overshadowed by the flamboyant villains and special effects, but at least Michael Keaton and Val Kilmer, the other two actors to play the role, gave the character a brooding complexity that made him a sympathetic hero.

Clooney's Batman, however, is so shallow, he makes Adam West's performance on the old TV show look like powerful method acting. Perhaps the most alarming evidence of Clooney's inappropriateness for the role comes near the movie's mid-section. Upon hearing that his beloved butler Alfred is dying, Clooney smiles! Knowing what we do about the relationship between the two men, how can we possibly expect that Bruce Wayne would smile upon learning such news?

As Batman's partner, Robin, Chris O'Donnell (reprising his "Batman Forever" role) is equally irritating. O'Donnell wants his character to be rebellious and hot-headed, but instead, he comes off as a whiny brat in need of a spanking. On the upside, Alicia Silverstone is cute as Alfred's niece, Barbara, who later joins the dynamic duo as the feisty crimefighter Batgirl. But still, her character is so skimpily written, Batgirl seems almost like an afterthought.

In addition to the lackluster characters, the movie's lightning-quick cinematography is quite annoying. I guess it was intended to inspire excitement, but instead, I felt disoriented and nauseous.

No, "Batman and Robin" is not all it was built up to be. And so much less.

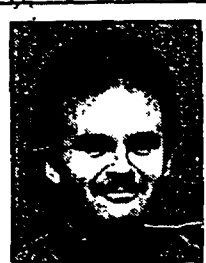

Downing Farms' new nine offers 'up north' feeling

Rome wasn't built in a day and neither is a good golf course.

Downing Farms is living proof. The Northville course opened for its full season in 1993 as a nine-hole facility.

Since then, rough edges have been smoothed out, a clubhouse built and nine more holes added. The second nine, which will be blended with the original holes to make 18, opened Tuesday.

"It was always in the back of my mind," owner Chuck Downing said of adding the new holes. "But we wanted to see how we liked running a nine-hole course first."

It took more than a year to turn Downing Farms from a nine to an 18-hole course.

Chuck said he and his family did most of the work. Adding the new holes was easier than making the first nine, he said, because there was less land-clearing.

"It was more open," Downing said. "It was more of moving dirt from point A to point B. We moved about 20,000 yards of dirt."

And with good results. Particularly interesting are

new holes 13-17.

Railroad tracks separate the holes from the rest of the course. Golfers actually go underneath the tracks to get to the new links.

While many of Downing Farms' original holes give golfers that "up north" feel, these new holes do so even more.

No. 14 is a perfect example.

At 387-yards it's one of the longer par 4s at Downing. The hole plays uphill most of the way with woodlands running the length on the right side. Four large Chicken-Hawks also reside near the hole and fly overhead frequently.

A large pond comes into play if you hit a long tee shot to the left. For most players, this hole requires two long shots for a chance at par.

"It may become our signature hole," Jim Downing said.

All five holes beyond the tracks will provide a good challenge for golfers.

Take the 90-yard 15th. A medium size green is hidden from view as it sits in a bowl. Golfers can only see

about half the flag stick making it difficult to gauge distance.

Add the fact that a pond sits directly behind the green and No. 15 is sure to see its share of bogeys.

The 16th and 17th are both under 300 yards. That's short for a par 4 no matter how you cut it.

But the holes still require smart golf with water coming into play. Better to play it safe with an iron off the tee here than end up in the drink.

Chuck Downing said he and architect Harry Bowers didn't have tons of land to work with. But he doesn't think it hurts the course.

"127 acres is not a lot room," Downing said. "But it's not that confining. The shortness doesn't take away from the course."

Located at 8145 W. Seven Mile Road, Downing Farms plays at a little more than 6,000 yards from the back tees and considerably shorter from the middle and front tees.

The addition of nine holes forced Downing to make

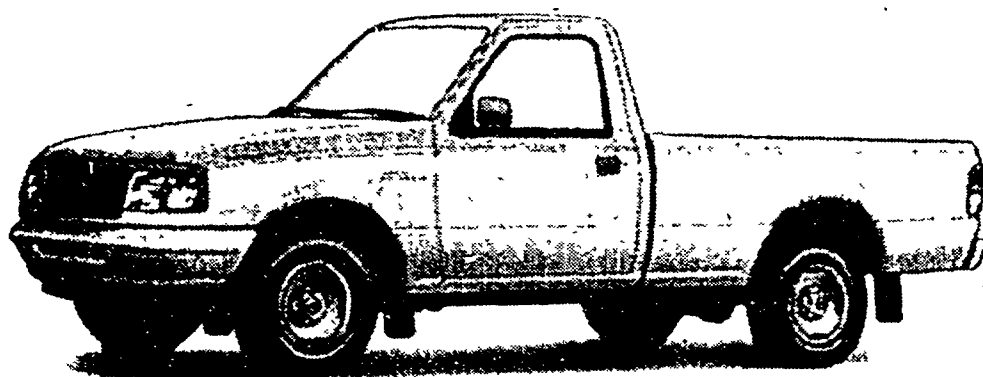

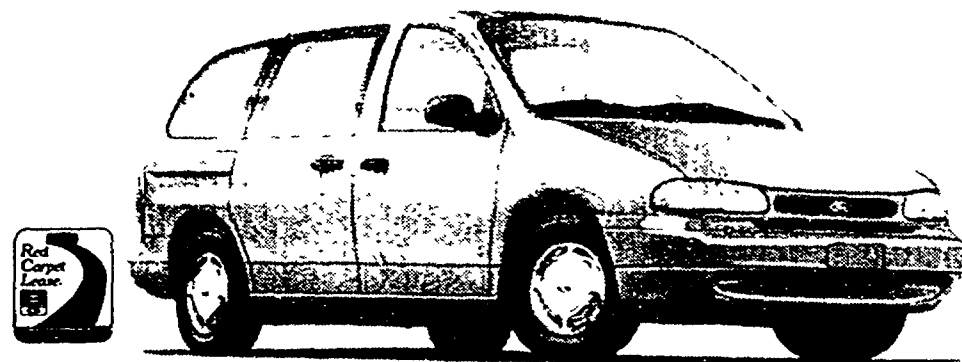

Breastfeeding noted as best source of nutrition for infants

The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends breastfeeding as the best source of infant nutrition. Why is breastfeeding so good for you and your baby? Consider:

- Breastmilk contains antibodies which protect your baby against infections. Breastfed infants have fewer ear infections, upper respiratory infections and episodes of diarrhea. Many scientific studies have confirmed that infants fed formula are sicker and hospitalized more frequently than breastfed babies. Breastfed infants are also less likely to die of sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS).

- Breastfed infants are rarely colicky since the protein in breastmilk is so easily digested. A happier baby means less stress and more rest for everyone in the household.

- Breastmilk is a complete source of nutrition during your baby's first five or six months of life. Your milk is unique. It is constantly changing and adapting to meet your baby's individual needs.

- Breastfeeding is very convenient. There is no need to mix or heat formula, and you always have a ready supply with you. This is especially helpful in the middle of the night or when you are out running errands.

- Breastmilk also is free, thus very economical. The estimated cost of feeding an infant formula ranges from \$1,200 to \$1,800 per year. If your baby develops a milk or formula intolerance,

specialty formulas can cost over \$2,000 per year.

Breastfeeding uses up maternal fat stores gained during pregnancy. The hormones involved in breastfeeding stimulate uterine contractions allowing your stomach to regain pre-pregnancy flatness more quickly.

Renting or purchasing a quality electric breastpump allows you to easily provide breast milk when separated from your infant.

How can you make breastfeeding "work" for you?

Prenatal education is an important factor for success. There are many books written for breastfeeding mothers which are extremely helpful. Consider enrolling in a prenatal breastfeeding class. Many hospitals offer classes. Check with your health care provider.

Before your baby is born identify support systems you can call on, such as other breastfeeding mothers or family members.

Choose a health care provider for your baby who is supportive and knowledgeable about breastfeeding.

Plan to breastfeed your baby as soon as possible after delivery, and keep your baby with you throughout your hospital stay. Nurse your baby frequently and avoid the use of pacifiers or supplemental bottles, at least until you and your baby feel comfortable with breastfeeding.

Beware of "free" formula samples ... early

introduction of a bottle will frequently lead to early weaning from the breast. Those few bottles are free - you have to buy the rest.

Don't hesitate to ask for help. Most hospitals now have certified lactation consultants on staff. Early contact with a lactation professional can help you through any early difficulties you may experience. Remember, you are doing something wonderful for your baby - providing a gift that will last a lifetime.

**Garden tip:
Home-grown
tastes better**

Q. Why do home-grown vegetables taste so good?

A. The secret is freshness. Within a few hours after harvesting, the produce usually makes its way to the dining table. On the other hand, most commercial produce must be packed on boats, trucks, rail cars or planes before it ever reaches the store and, eventually, the table. When it says "fresh" at the supermarket, the produce is at least a few days old, to say the least.

For example, some tender vegetables, such as tomatoes, are harvested green and ripened later in storage. They are too fragile to withstand the rigors of travel and are maybe 2 or 3 weeks old before they actually show up in a tossed salad. That makes a huge difference in quality and flavor, whatever way you look at it, because the quality and flavor of garden-grown produce begins to ebb the very moment it's plucked.

Of course, commercial vegetable growers, wholesalers, shippers and retailers do the best they can to bring in quality produce and they do a pretty good job of it. However, time takes its toll, because the flavor of 4-day-old produce can't hold a candle to the produce harvested from the garden and delivered directly to the kitchen.

Don't take "garden fresh" too seriously at the supermarket. It's advertising, even when it has no conceivable basis in facts.

There are three factors that influence flavor: geography, soil and breeding.

Flavor is regional because of the diversity in humidity, temperature and rainfall. Flavor is also affected by the way soil is amended. More than anything else, soil composition accounts for the difference in taste between your beets and your neighbor's. That's why people say organically grown produce tastes better.

It's not the absence of commercial fertilizers and pesticides that makes it better, it's the large amounts of manure, compost and humus that organic gardeners till into the soil. The fluffier and looser the soil, the more easily nutrients, oxygen and water are able to reach roots to nourish plants.

Thriving, well-fed plants, in turn, create more fruit sugars in their foliage, seeds, fruits and roots. Breeding, open-pollinated and heirloom varieties seem to have more flavor, too.

An heirloom is defined as any variety that was in existence before 1940. Most are open-pollinated, which means left to pollination that occurs naturally in the garden and the wild, rather than by the hand of the breeder.

Unlike seeds saved from hybrids (they don't breed true), you can plant open-pollinated seeds and expect the plants to be 90 percent to 95 percent just like the parent. This is why most experts prefer open-pollinated and heirloom varieties as their favorites for flavor and not the new hybrids. And the good tasting varieties get planted year after year.

Q. This summer I am planning a garden. My only problem is cucumbers. My garden area is a plot of fertile land in direct sunlight. Can you please give me some helpful tips on cucumber growing?

A. Make your first sowing when danger of frost is past. Rows can be 4 to 5 feet apart, with a plant every 2 or 4 feet in the row. Cucumbers grow best in a fertile, light, well-drained soil.

To keep vines productive, pick before fruits are too mature. For nice, straight fruit, plants grow best on a trellis.

Suggested types are Bush cucumbers, which take about one-third the space of the usual vining types, and the Burpless hybrid, which is easily digestible, juicy, crispy and delicious. One can obtain these from W. Atlee Burpee Co., 300 Park Ave., Warminster, PA 18974.

Q. As a first-year gardener, all the choices of vegetable varieties offered in the new seed catalogs confuse me. How can I ever make a decision?

A. The best way is to select varieties recommended for your area. Here's my suggestion.

Look over the catalogs carefully and review the new flower and vegetable varieties. Be careful about reading plant descriptions. In addition to sowing the right kind of seeds, be sure they are sown at the right time.

'OLD WORLD' HOMES

Developer says style will stand the test of time

In Livingston County, where impressive subdivisions abound, it's difficult to find one that stands above the crowd, but Stonegate, a new development in Hamburg Township, manages to do just that, and with style.

An open space community located off Cunningham Lake Road, just minutes from downtown Brighton, Stonegate makes a grand statement from the moment you pass through the massive

entrance gates that flank its entrance.

In an area that is bordered by hundreds of acres of state land, the first phase of Stonegate features 39 rolling wooded lots, winding private roads and 18 acres of open space which includes walking paths, ponds and a brook.

The topography aside, one of the most distinctive features of the development are the retaining walls used to preserve the tree line and soil along the roads says George Mansour, president of Pace Developments Inc. of Clarkston.

The boulders, while native to Michi-

gan, had to be brought in to the site. Thus far about 1,800 boulders have been brought in, and they're not done yet.

"My landscaper said it was the biggest job that he's ever seen," Mansour said.

Likewise, developing Stonegate was a challenge for Mansour, who has worked primarily in Oakland and Genesee counties. After three to four other developers passed up on developing the property, Mansour was determined to take on the project and see it through to completion despite the difficulties he encountered.

He credits his engineer as well as Hamburg Township for their roles in bringing the project to its fruition.

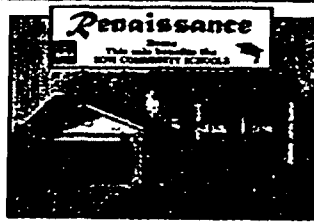
"The project brought out a lot of creativity out of myself, my engineer and the township," Mansour said.

In fact, his experience so inspired Mansour that he did something he'd never done before. He had the following etched upon a stone column at the subdivision entrance: "Integrity, vision and belief will prosper once you pass through

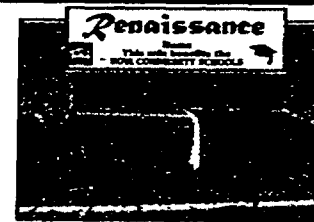

Q. I'm sick of falling in love with things I see in most decorating magazines, then reading the fine print to discover that the elegant little footstool in the corner costs a million dollars. My husband always reminds me that I have champagne taste and a beer pocketbook, but what about people like me who have to decorate on a budget?

A. We all decorate "on a budget." The problem, to paraphrase George Orwell, is that some budgets are created "more equal" than others. Never mind. It's equally true that some people's sense of style is also "more equal" than others. You can achieve rich decorating effects without being rich at all. What you lack in cash, you can make up with cachet. But it takes a discerning eye, an ability to spot good lines and classic designs, and edit out the ordinary and obviously cheap.

the stairwell with pretty floral prints that relate to her wallpaper; bring just the wallpaper border down the stairwell; decorate the stair risers with motifs cut from the wallpaper; or carpet the stairs to match the rug in her room.

Q. My son has shot his first deer - we live in Vermont and hunting is a way of life up here. We have most of that deer in the freezer, but my husband had the head mounted and wants to hang it over the fireplace. I'm not really keen on the idea - from a design point of view only. Our living room is country but not rustic. I'm afraid a trophy would just look tacky. What do you think?

A. See if you can't talk that deer head into the family room or front hall, if it really upsets your decor. But as long as you put the rest of the deer to good use, I say don't give "tacky" another thought.

MAKING PROVISIONS

One common provision on purchase contracts is the mortgage-contingency rider which allows the buyer a specified period of time to obtain a commitment for financing at a specified interest rate for a certain amount of money. This critical protection for the buyer to void the contract without penalty in cases in which the buyer is unable to obtain financing after making a reasonable effort to do so within the time provided. Because this type of clause is favorable to the buyer, a real estate agent may suggest that the buyer obtain a prequalification from the lender. This gives the seller a degree of confidence that the buyer will not use the clause to void the contract.

Though it sounds as though all the advantages of obtaining prequalification for a loan go to the seller, there are things to be gained by buyers, too. First, knowing exactly one's ceiling for indebtedness will eliminate wasting time looking at homes beyond reach. Secondly, it can spare you the cost of multiple applications for loans for one property after another. Finally, if you end up in a bidding war for a very desirable property, having been preapproved for a loan will give you the edge because you're a "sure thing" to the seller. HINT: Prospective buyers should also be wary of including a mortgage-contingency rider in the purchase contract because the seller may refuse to agree to it. This is another good reason for buyers to seek prequalification.

'Beauty Roses' pitcher made in Staffordshire

Q. Enclosed is a photo of a small pitcher, which is part of my grandmother's luncheon set. She purchased these dishes around 1920. There are four each plates, cups, saucers, a creamer and a sugar bowl. Each dish is marked "W.H. Grindley & Co. - Beauty Roses."

She only used the set when she had ladies over for afternoon coffee and a game of Bunco.

Can you give me an idea of what the value of my set would

be?

A. Beauty Roses is a Flow Blue pattern that was made by W.H. Grindley & Co. Ltd., Staffordshire, England. It has made ironstone and earthenware since 1880.

Your circa 1925 dishes would probably be worth about \$575 to \$675 for the set.

Q. This mark is on the bottom of a porcelain figurine of two people climbing into bed. It is approximately 4 inches tall. On the base is the inscription, "The Last One in Bed Put Out the

Light."

What can you tell me about my figurine?

A. Your figurine group is a fairing. Fairings featured amusing or sentimental themes and were originally given as prizes or sold at Victorian fairs in England.

In the 1890s, when many of the English molds were sold to German factories, the colors became somewhat garish and the quality declined.

Springer & Co., Elbogen, Bohemia, which was in business

from 1815 to 1945, used this mark around 1900.

Your fairing would probably be worth about \$225 to \$275.

Q. I have a yellow Depression Glass fruit bowl in the Iris and Herringbone pattern.

Who was the manufacturer, when was it made and what is it worth?

A. The Jeanette Glass Co., Jeanette, Pa., produced this pattern. They first made the Iris and Herringbone pattern from 1928 to 1932. It was later reproduced in the 1950s and the 1970s.

As a rule, the yellow dishes were not early pieces. Your fruit bowl's value would probably be about \$25 to \$55.

Q. I would like some information on a plaque that is in the form of a man's head and his dog.

It is in relief and extremely realistic. The man's eyes and teeth are so well done that they look real. On the back are the words "Bossons England."

A. Your plaque is commonly called a wall mask. It was made by

W.H. Bossons Ltd., Congleton, England, which has been in business since 1946. Bossons also made figures, plaques and other decorative items.

The value of your wall mask would probably be about \$125 to \$150.

the stonegate."

Stonegate, which will encompass a total of over 130 acres when it's complete, has gone great guns since breaking ground last spring, exceeding all expectations for sales.

Of the 39 lots offered in phase one, which average 3/4 acre, only a handful are left.

"It's going crazy. I never expected it to happen like that," Mansour said.

Jim Hysen and Carroll Strange, owners of Echelon Homes, echo Mansour's comment.

"We started last July and have been going non-stop. The demand is incredible," Hysen said.

With home prices averaging \$370,000 (this is a package price that includes the lot), that's more like phenomenal, since many upper-end subdivisions can take much longer to complete each phase.

Echelon Homes, a Brighton-based custom builder, is one of the two builders in the subdivision. Their homes combine the latest in custom features with a look that Hysen describes as "period architecture."

"We build homes that look 'Old World,'" Hysen said.

"They [the style] looked good 100 years ago and will look good a 100 years from now."

A tour through one of Echelon's recently completed homes in Stonegate confirms Hysen's statement that with their homes, "we custom design everything from the ground up, everything is unique about this to the customers taste."

The 3,400-square-foot two-story features four bedrooms, including a first floor master suite with a two-person Jacuzzi bath, a

great room with a soaring 18-foot ceiling, floor-to-ceiling windows and gas fireplace, an elegant foyer with marble flooring and a grand, open staircase and a walk-out basement.

The roomy kitchen, which is outfitted with maple cabinets and flooring, has a fireplace as well as a stairway to the second floor. Closets, abundant throughout the home, are large. Windows are high efficiency with a wood interior and an extruded aluminum exterior.

The insulation, by industry standards, is generous with R-15 in the side walls and R-40 in the ceilings.

One of the more unique features in Echelon's homes, and a feature the company introduced to the area, is the use of soft-edged corners in all their homes. The difference from the traditional sharp-edged corners may be subtle, but it is a nice touch.

"It's available but it's not very widely used," says Strange, adding that there's no substantial benefit other than "it's an aesthetic thing."

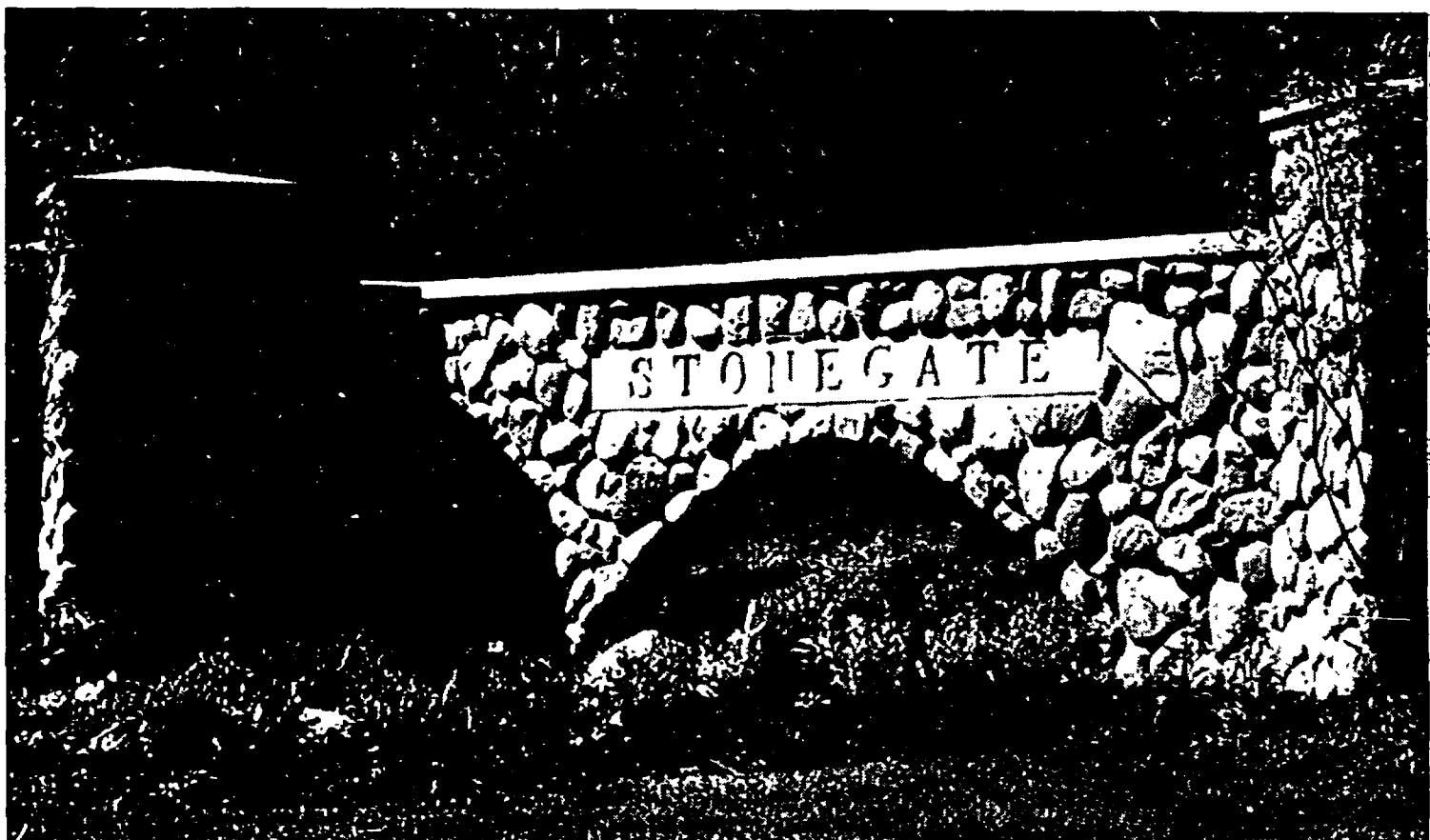
Several of the homes Echelon is building in the subdivision are "smart houses."

The homes are pre-wired for everything including state-of-the-art theater sound to security systems with monitoring devices.

Thus far, the majority of the homeowners in the subdivision are move-up buyers from the Brighton area, with the balance coming from the outskirts of Livingston County and metro-Detroit area.

Mansour plans to begin preliminary work on phase two, which will have 30 lots, by late summer or early fall so that building could begin in 1998.

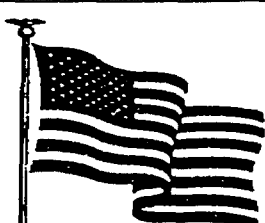
With an open space plan, hilltop sites and more of those boulder walls, the second phase of Stonegate sounds as if it, too, will make its mark.



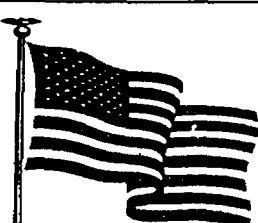

"It's very healthy food," adds owner Mike Ahmad. "Most our dishes are baked, broiled or grilled."

While 70 seats may be a bit small compared to some eateries, Ahmad said it's the perfect size for his needs. He said he can control the quality of service and food better in a more cozy setting.

"This is the right size for middle eastern food," he commented.

Thus far, Aladdin's has received a good support from the community. Ahmad said business is about 80 percent of what he'd like it to be.

Considering the restaurant's extensive menu, business is sure to keep growing.

Aladdin's offers both many choices for vegetarians.

Stuffed cabbage, falafel, and mjadara, lentil and rice topped with crispy onions and spices, are a few vegetarian appetizers. Soups such as crushed lentil, salads and entree like vegetarian ghallaba are also available.

More than a dozen middle eastern entrees offer great variety at Aladdin's.

Shish kabob, chicken kafta, which is ground chicken breast mixed with parsley, onions and seasonings, and baked kibbie are popular dishes. Each entree is served with soup or salad, rice or fries.

For more traditional American tastes, the restaurant has N.Y. strip steaks and lamb chops. Seafood dishes include hushwider, white fish and shrimp, among others.

Lunch-goers will find a variety of middle eastern sandwiches and hamburgers.

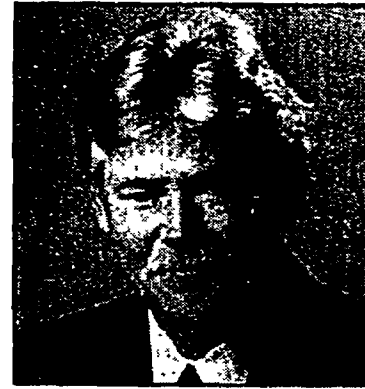

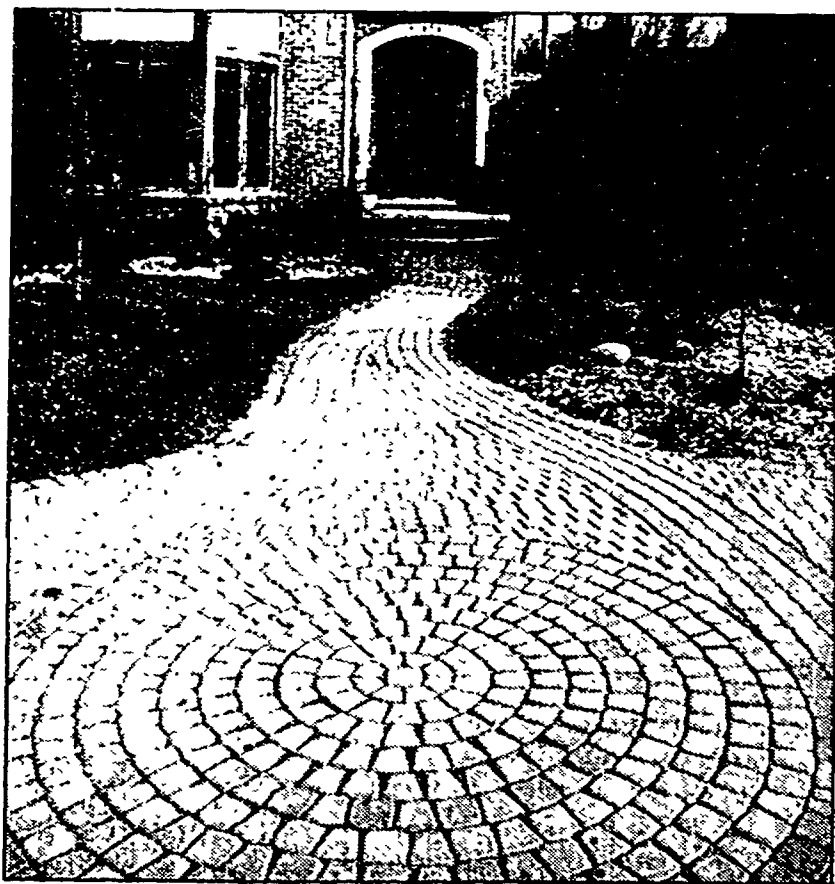

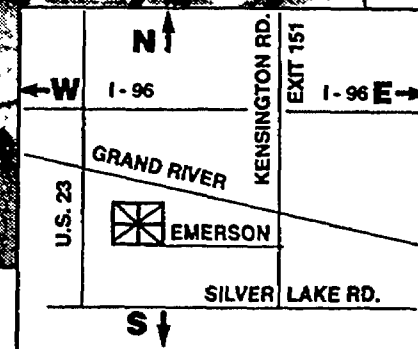

Review insurance to protect assets

Here's an easy way to protect your assets and your family's financial security: review your insurance coverage. The Michigan Association of Certified Public Accountants points out that a review will provide you with greater peace of mind and may also free up some cash that you can use to build your bank account.

HOMEOWNERS INSURANCE

Make sure your homeowners policy covers the current replacement value of your home — the amount it would cost to rebuild your house — not its market value. Also, be sure the contents of your home are adequately insured. If you own valuable collectibles, jewelry or expensive antique furniture, you may need additional protection.

If you operate a home-based business, check to see if your policy covers the business equipment or inventory you have in your home. Depending on the value of the equipment and inventory, you may need to get a rider to your current policy or obtain a separate policy. Also, be aware that homeowners policies do not cover business liability. You'll need to get separate coverage for that.

DISABILITY INSURANCE

Generally, you should have a disability policy that replaces at least 60 percent of your monthly

earned income in the event that you become sick or injured and are unable to work. If you have an employer-provided plan, check the benefit amount to determine if it would adequately provide for you and your family. If not, you'll need to supplement your employer's plan with an individual policy. The best coverage is "own-occupation coverage," which guarantees benefit payments if you are unable to perform the substantial and material duties of your profession. You'll also want to have a policy that has (1) a waiting period of no more than 60 to 90 days and that provides lifetime benefits or, at a minimum, benefits until age 65; (2) a cost-of-living adjustment rider that protects future benefits from inflation; and (3) a non-cancelable policy; and (4) future insurability option to increase insurance coverage if income rises.

LIFE INSURANCE

If you have a growing family, it's also time to check your life insurance policy and that of your spouse. As a general rule, you should purchase a policy that provides coverage equal to five or six times your annual income. Factors that affect the amount of insurance you need include (1) expenses, such as burial fees and outstanding debts; (2) the amount of income your survivors will need to live on after you die, minus the income they can expect from other

sources; (3) the number of dependents you need to provide for and whether those dependents have special needs or require special care; and (4) estate taxes. Finally, check the insurer's financial rating with a recognized rating service, such as A.M. Best.

LIFELINE'S GUIDE TO A HEALTHY HOME

In the same way that exercise and good nutrition help you stay well, keeping your home safe and clean can add a lot to a healthy lifestyle.

HOW TO AVOID HOUSE HAZARDS

Whether you live in a house, apartment or condominium, you face certain safety hazards that can be avoided by keeping the following in mind:

HANDLE HAZARDOUS MATERIALS WITH CARE

According to information from the Oakland County Health Division, a material is considered hazardous if it is:

- *toxic* (can injure or kill if swallowed, inhaled or absorbed through the skin)
- *flammable* (may explode or ignite, even when cool)
- *an irritant* (can irritate or inflame the skin, eyes, nose, throat or lungs).

These can include cleaners of all kinds, automotive fluids, beauty products and lawncare chemicals. Proper handling, storage and disposal of hazardous materials is essential to your safety and health, they say, and recommend that you:

- *Read labels carefully* to see how to handle hazardous products. Be sure to use the correct amount, don't mix products and wear protective gloves, glasses and masks if necessary.
- *Store products* with sealed lids in a secure area away from children and pets. Make sure all products are clearly labeled; store them in their original containers if possible.
- *Ensure proper ventilation* when working with toxic vapors, and always clean up afterwards, carefully washing tools, surfaces and your hands.
- *To dispose of hazardous materials* you can see if your city has a service that collects them, contact a private disposal company listed in the Yellow Pages under "Waste Disposal," recycle them (for example, many service stations take used automobile oil, batteries, etc.), or you can use them up. Many products have a long shelf life and may work for years.

A number of communities in Oakland County have a contract with a resource recovery company that accepts drop offs of hazardous materials at certain sites. For information, call SOCRRA at (248) 288-5153.



DEPEND ON DETECTION SERVICES

Your house should have carbon monoxide detectors in the basement and outside sleeping areas. Also, add or replace smoke detectors. Attach fire extinguishers to the kitchen wall, away from the stove, and on the basement stairs.

KEEP YOUR EYES ON THOSE FRIES

Cooking is the number one cause of home fires. To prevent them, you can do the following: Stay near the stove; most fires start when people leave their cooking unattended. When you do cook, wear short or tight-fitting sleeves, or roll-up long sleeves. Keep flammable items like cooking oils, dish towels and pot holders

at least three feet from cooking surfaces and heat sources, and make sure you keep all cooking surfaces clean and free of food and grease build-up, which can ignite.

- *Warm your water.* Turn down the water heater temperature to avoid scalding. A temperature of 120 degrees is plenty hot enough for sanitary dish washing, cleaning and bathing.
- *Throw out slippery rugs.* Falls are a leading cause of death and injury around the house, and throw rugs are a major cause of falls. If you must use them, tape small rugs to the floor with double sided tape, and replace it regularly. Never put a throw rug at the top or bottom of a stair case.

- *Save the hothouse for flowers.* Except for people over age 75, indoor temperatures of 70 degrees and above are way too hot. Respiratory passages can become parched when the house temperature reaches the 70s, making them more susceptible to cold viruses. Babies' thermal systems aren't as efficient as adults; they're most comfortable when the heat is turned to the upper 60s, and they're dressed in light to medium weight layers. Experts recommend a setting of about 70 degrees for older people.

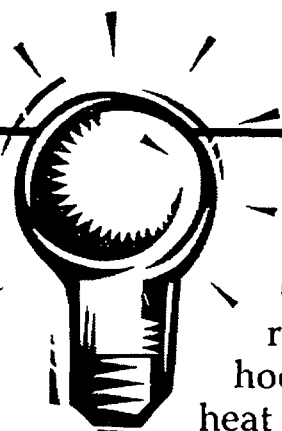
GERMS BE GONE!

Sharing this planet with us are between 300,000 and a million species of bacteria and about 5,000 known viruses. Luckily, most are harmless or can be controlled with vaccines and antibiotics. However, they also are responsible for problems ranging from major epidemics to annoying allergies.

The number one way to get rid of germs is to wash your hands carefully with soap or detergent, which lifts dirt off your hands and dissolves it, says Carole Baker, Certified Pediatric Nurse Practitioner with Botsford Hospital, explaining that hand washing is the most important health care lesson she gives parents and children. "The most common complaints we get are from upper respiratory infections and ear infections — both caused by passing germs," Baker says. Be sure to wash before eating, after using the bathroom, when visiting public places (especially hospitals), and if someone you have contact with has a cold or other viral infection.

THWART THIEVES

Trim shrubs that block windows and entrances, and install exterior lights or light-motion detectors. Get to know your neighbors, so you can look out for each other's homes when away. Make a photo inventory of all your possessions and be sure to store it somewhere other than in your house.



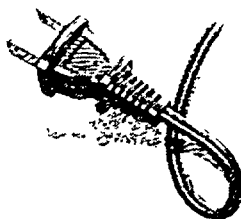
WATCH THE WATTS

Ceiling fixtures, recessed lights and hooded lamps trap heat and may lead to fires if you use a bulb with too many watts. If you don't know the recommended wattage, you're safe using 60 watts or less.

Keep kids and cords apart. Window-blind and drapery cords are among the products most frequently associated with toddler strangulations.

Tie cords securely near the top of window coverings and keep cribs away from any cords. And keep an eye on children around electrical cords. Crawling babies tend to yank lamps off a table with the greatest of ease.

Don't wrestle with wiring. Check all lamp and appliance cords for frays, and test electrical outlets and switches to see if they are warm, which means the wiring may be unsafe. Don't use until an electrician checks things out.



To reduce the number of harmful germs lurking in your kitchen and bathrooms, try these tips:

- *The warm, damp bath room is the perfect place for mold spores* to multiply, as well as near heaters and humidifiers. To cut back on mold, use a cloth shower curtain that can be washed easily and replace the liner every four months.
- *Keep a bag of silica gel* (available in camera stores) or charcoal in the room — they both absorb moisture.
- *Wash filters in heaters* and humidifiers every two weeks.
- *Let towels and wash cloths dry*, and change them often; change toothbrushes at least every three months.
- *Carpets (especially when damp) harbor germs*, so use rugs or bath mats, and wash them often; and clean bathroom sinks, faucets, toilets, bathtub and floors with a disinfectant like Lysol, or simple chlorine bleach.

KEEP A CLEAN KITCHEN

The kitchen is potentially the most contaminated room in the house, since food-borne bacteria can enter the kitchen every time you shop. In fact, the U.S. Department of Agriculture estimates that at least half of the 80 million cases of food-caused illness originate in a family's kitchen.

Salmonella and E. coli are sometimes found in raw meat and poultry. Proper cooking kills these harmful germs, but they can still be spread from juices that are not carefully cleaned up after preparation. "For food and meat preparation, use a cutting board that repels bacteria and always wash it with hot, soapy water following use," says Carol Fitzpatrick, R. N., from the Infection Control department at Oakland General Hospital. Keep meat and poultry separate from other foods, using separate cutting boards for meat and vegetables. Run plastic cutting boards, sponges, cooking utensils and plates through the dishwasher, where high temperatures kill germs. Toss out cutting boards, cooking

utensils, pots and serving dishes when they become cracked, chipped or grooved.

Fitzpatrick recommends other measures for keeping germs out of your kitchen:

- *Avoid using the same dish rag* for spills wiping your hands and drying your hands. Dishrags and towels should be washed often.
- *Clean your dishwasher, sink and trash* containers regularly with a disinfectant such as chlorine bleach.
- *Disinfect your refrigerator* twice a month with a bleach and water mixture.
- *Clean cabinet handles, door knobs* and the telephone receiver.
- *Tightly seal the lids* on food jars to keep away ants and other insects.

The simplest rule to remember is "Clean it now," with hot water and dishwashing liquid to loosen debris and microbes, then hot water to rinse them off.

HOW TO DETOXYFY YOUR HOME

Continual exposure to pollutants in your home can upset your immune system causing major diseases and minor allergies.

Dust and dust mites, animal dander, molds and chemicals can cause allergic reactions, says Michael Rowe, M.D., of the Allergy and Asthma Center of Michigan. "Twenty to twenty-five percent of the population has allergies," Dr. Rowe said, "and most of these have trouble from indoor triggers." Dr. Rowe says the first line of defense is to avoid the triggers, but if this is impossible, patients are given medications or allergy injections to control symptoms.

To help rid your home of irritating or even dangerous substances, you can do the following:

- *Clean up the air.* According to the Environmental Protection Agency, indoor air pollution has become one of our main environmental health threats — maybe even more detrimental to humans than toxic waste and ozone layer depletion. These air pollutants contribute to disease, including asthma and allergies. Doctors and respiratory therapists recommend air cleaners with true high efficiency particulate arrestors (HEPA) to reduce airborne contaminants.
- *Remove radon.* One of the most toxic gases found in a house is radon — a colorless, odorless radioactive gas found in rocks and soil. This carcinogen leaks into homes through cracks and holes in the foundation.

Asbestos insulation and poorly maintained water heaters also give off toxic gases. Call the nearest chapter of the EPA for information about testing your house for radon. Check your basement for cracks and seal them immediately, and have asbestos insulation removed by a professional.

- *Dust those mites.* Where possible, opt for wood floors or rugs instead of wall-to-wall carpet if you're allergic to dust. Vacuum upholstered furniture and floor coverings once a week. Shake cushions and area rugs out doors and expose them to sunlight at least once a month to kill dust mites.
- *Don't forget the formaldehyde.* This hazardous chemical and others, such as phenol and ethanol, are easily absorbed into the skin. To reduce exposure to these toxins, avoid rubber cement or super glue (or wear gloves). A safer choice is a non-toxic white or yellow glue. Make sure your room is well ventilated.
- *Get the lead out.* If your home was

built between 1910 and 1940, there's a good chance the water pipes are made of lead, which can seep into your tap water. If your house was built before 1978, your house may have paint with lead in it. Lead paint can cause harm to the brain, kidneys, nervous system and blood. According to information from the Oakland County Health Division, those most at risk are children and women of childbearing age.

Their recommendations for lowering the lead count in your home include the following:

- *Use certified contractors* recommended by your local health department for lead abatement.
- *Have your children (especially those under six) screened* for lead contamination.
- *Before you use water from your faucet, let it run for a few minutes* — especially in the morning. (Lead levels are highest when water sits

DETROIT HAS DEADLY AIR

Step outside your home and you're confronted with a world of health hazards. Beware:

The Natural Resources Defense Council recently reviewed data from more than 200 cities in the U.S. and measured the highest concentrations of particles from smoke stacks, trucks, cars and other sources. The particles are especially hazardous to people with breathing problems and the elderly. Detroit was ranked fifth in the number of heart and lung disease deaths caused by these polluted particles, after Los Angeles, New York, Chicago and Philadelphia.

According to the American Lung Association of Michigan, ozone, the main component of smog, is found in most urban areas especially in the summer. High ozone levels can cause wheezing, coughing, shortness of breath and chest pain.

The Lung Association recommends that people who suffer allergies and respiratory problems need to take precautions when pollution levels are high. This includes curbing strenuous outdoor exercise, or exercising in the early morning or evening, when levels are lowest; avoid exercising near congested roads or highways; avoid



driving in heavy traffic; even staying indoors if necessary. Be sure to alert teachers, camp counselors and other caregivers if your child has respiratory problems.

Dr. Rowe who provides allergy information for WWJ Newsradio Allergy Alert and The Weather Channel on cable television, says that pollution levels tend to be higher on warm, overcast days when the air is trapped by cloud cover.

To find out whether outdoor air pollution levels are high in your area, check the weather reports. For more information about air pollution, you can contact the American Lung Association of Michigan at (810) 559-5100.



HEAR THIS!

More than 20 million Americans are regularly exposed to noise loud enough to cause hearing loss, according to a *Journal of the American Medical Association* report.

Constant exposure to environmental clamor such as jackhammer din, auto horns and the clanks and squeals of machinery are linked to insomnia, high blood pressure, peptic ulcers and reduced learning in children.

To reduce the potential for hearing loss, stay away from loud noises as much as you can. If you can, use earplugs or protective earmuffs. In your home, you can place a window air conditioner or a sturdy box fan where the hum will mask loud outside noises, or hang heavy drapes over windows facing noisy streets.

overnight.) Use cold water for drinking or cooking; hot tap water draws lead particles from the pipes.

- *Avoid exposure to electromagnetic fields.* Electric blankets, microwave ovens, toaster ovens, refrigerators, computers and televisions all give off low frequency electromagnetic fields that some studies have shown to cause cancer. It's best to stand away from appliances when they're in use, and instead of using an electric blanket, bury yourself under a cozy layer of blankets.

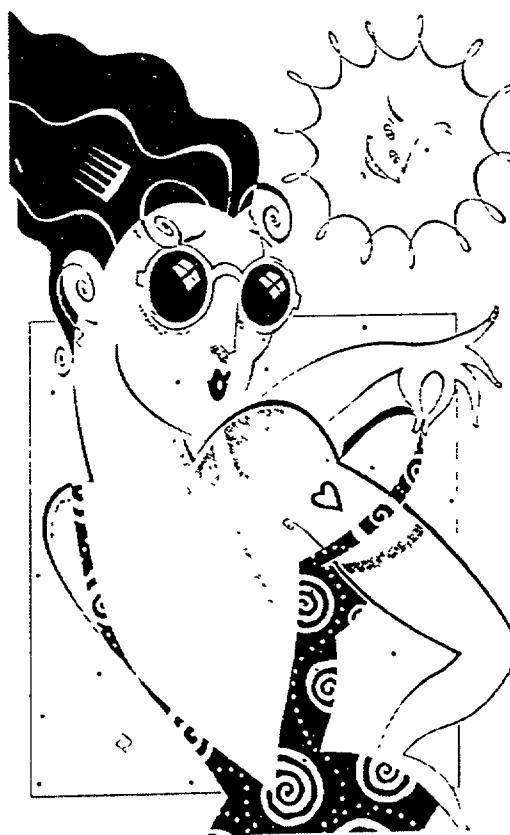
OUR LAKES ARE GREAT BUT THE RIVER IS WRETCHED

WARM WEATHER WOES

Ah, summer in Michigan — sunshine, warm breezes, fresh water — and all that itching!! In addition to the pleasures, there are some pitfalls of playing outdoors in the summer. The following is a guide to some of the season's most notorious irritants:

POISONOUS PLANTS

Poison ivy, oak and sumac are abundant, especially near water. Learn to recognize these plants by studying photos at the library or your local nursery, then either stay away from them or wear proper clothes to protect yourself. Try long pants tucked into your socks, closed-toe shoes and long-sleeved shirts if you know you'll be in the vicinity of these pesky plants. If your skin touches one of them, head off a rash by sloshing rubbing alcohol over the affected area immediately. Follow that with a good dousing of water. Then wash your clothes, tents or other materials (including your pets) that may have brushed against the plants to remove poisonous oils.

IRRITATING INSECTS

Wasps, bees, mosquitoes and flies can be more than irritating if you are allergic to them. According to Paul Auerbach, M.D., author of *Medicine for the Outdoors* (Little Brown & Co.), about four percent of the population is allergic to bee or wasp venom. For these people, a sting can cause hives, nausea, breathing difficulties, even death. Anyone who experiences a severe reaction to insects should see his or her doctor immediately. Those who are allergic should always carry a prescription allergy kit.

Wasps and bees love the smell of certain foods, so watch out when it's meal time and you're serving meat, fruits and sugary soft drinks. Be sure to clean up carefully after eating, so bugs don't linger around the leftovers. Bees also flock to flowers and flower-like substances, such as people who dress colorfully or wear perfume. Stay out of trouble by wearing earth tones and forget the fragrance.

HOVERING HEAT

Some days are so hot, you can almost see the heat hovering in the air. When it's that hot, you can suffer from heat rash, heat stroke or dehydration. Heat rash is caused by blocked or inflamed sweat glands from perspiration trapped on your skin under sweaty clothing. The small, raised spots that characterize heat rash tend to appear in places where your skin folds together — under the breasts, in the groin, under the arms. To prevent heat rash, wear loose-fitting garments made from fabrics that breathe, such as cotton. You can treat heat rash by splashing cool water on the affected areas, or applying cool compresses.

Heat stroke and heat exhaustion are caused by the body's inability to cool itself in prolonged exposure to heat. If you experience or witness these symptoms, seek medical attention immediately:

- confusion, agitation
- rapid breathing
- increased heart rate
- collapse or unconsciousness

To prevent heat stroke or exhaustion, avoid direct and prolonged sunlight and exertion in high temperatures. When you're in the sun, be sure to drink plenty of liquids.

HENRY FORD MULTI-ORGAN TRANSPLANT PROGRAM REACHES MILESTONES

Nearly 2,000 people ranging in age from 15 to 73 have had life-saving or life-enhancing transplants performed at Henry Ford Hospital.

Beginning with the hospital's first kidney transplant in 1968, the program has grown to include heart, lung, liver, pancreas, cornea and bone marrow transplantation.

In the last year and a half, three of the hospital's multi-organ transplant center's programs reached milestones.

The first came in March of 1996 when transplant surgeons performed the state's first split-liver transplant on two patients with end-stage liver disease. At that time, fewer than 20 such procedures had been done nationwide. The following month doctors performed a cross-racial living kidney transplant between two friends and co-workers — one who is white and the other who is black. Last year, only 24 cross-racial living kidney transplants were performed in the country.

Then, last month, surgeons performed their 201st and 202nd heart transplants on two teenage boys—a 15 year-old from Madison Heights and a 16 year-old from Trenton.

Nationwide, nearly 52,000 people, including 2,064 in Michigan, await organs. Michigan has one of the lowest donation rates in the country.

SUN AND SKIN: A DANGEROUS DUO

There's a temptation for many of us this time of year to bask in the sunshine to achieve that "healthy glow," but, by now we know that the glow is anything but healthy.

Suntan is, in fact, your skin trying to protect you from the dangers of ultraviolet radiation, which is more intense each year as the protective ozone layer is depleted.

More than 900,000 new cases of skin cancer are diagnosed each year, making the disease the number one cancer in the United States. According to Warren Brandes, D.O., with ENT Surgical Associates in Farmington Hills and Madison Heights, any skin spot that looks peculiar to you, especially if it changes color or shape, should be biopsied immediately. "This is the only way to properly diagnose skin cancer," he says, explaining that all types call for removal by surgery. Dr. Brandes sees about ten cases of skin cancer each month, mostly in people over age 50. "It takes years for the damaged skin to appear," he says. "This is why it's so important to tell young people not to bake in the sun."



SKIN CANCERS FALL INTO THE FOLLOWING CATEGORIES:

Basal cell carcinoma -- There are about 640,000 cases of basal cell carcinoma reported each year in this country. In the past, people were less concerned with it than with melanoma, the more deadly form of skin cancer. Recently, however, researchers suspect that basal cell carcinomas may be a marker for the presence of other cancers. About 40,000 basal cell patients studied recently at the Danish

Epidemiology Science Centre in Copenhagen were found to have a 13 percent higher incidence of other cancers. These included melanoma, cancers of the breast, lung, kidney, lip, salivary gland and larynx, and non-Hodgkin's lymphoma. The study showed that patients who were younger than 60 when the basal cell carcinoma was first diagnosed were most vulnerable to these other kinds of tumors. So, if you develop a basal cell carcinoma, you should be examined carefully at regular intervals for evidence of other disease. And remember, even though there is a genetic link in some cases of basal cell cancer, the bulk of cases occur after exposure to ultraviolet radiation.

Squamous cell carcinoma - About 100,000 people each year are diagnosed with this form of cancer, characterized by red, crusting bumps that can bleed or ulcerate — and spread. Although squamous cell carcinoma also is highly curable if caught early, it does cause about 2,300 deaths per year. Dermatologists treat this cancer using the same methods employed with basal cell carcinoma.

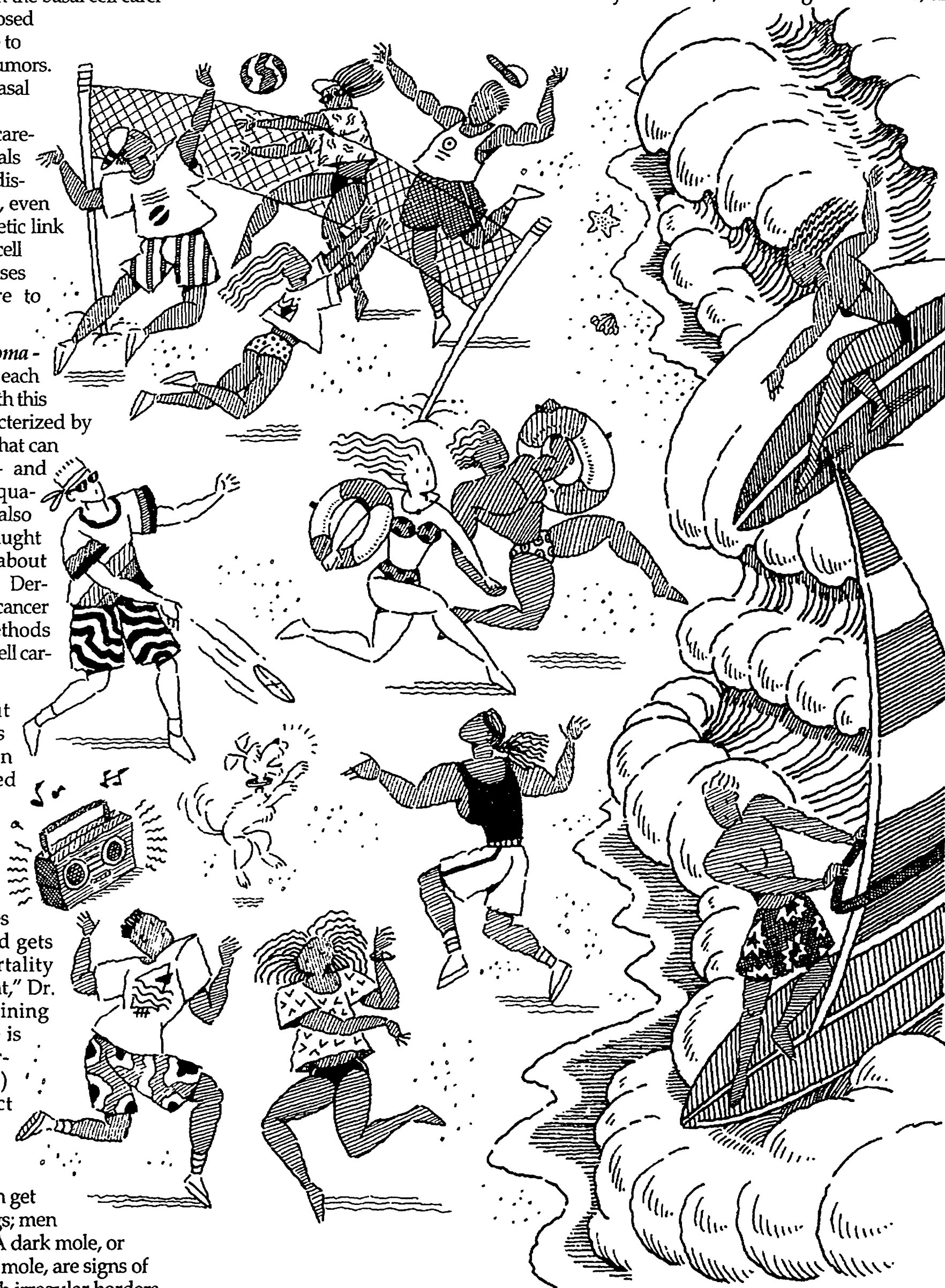
Melanoma -- About 35,000 people get this deadly form of skin cancer, which killed nearly 8,000 people in 1996. If untreated, it can spread throughout the body and kill you. "If the melanoma goes through the skin and gets into the fat, the mortality rate is 80 to 90 percent," Dr. Brandes says, explaining that the success rate is very good (five percent mortality rate) for those who detect melanoma while it remains in the skin tissue.

Women most often get melanoma on their legs; men on their upper back. A dark mole, or changes to an existing mole, are signs of melanoma. Moles with irregular borders

All adults should receive an annual skin cancer screening by a doctor, more frequently if a person has one or more risk factors. People also should learn how to check their skin for changes.

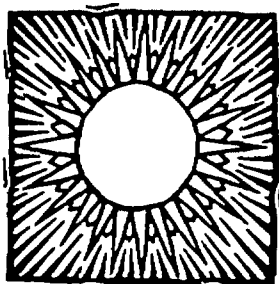
or multicolored moles are other indicators, Dr. Brandes says. Having a family history of the disease is a huge risk factor.

Since skin cancer can be cured if detected early, frequently checking for abnormal new moles, or old moles that change, is critical to stopping the disease before it becomes life-threatening. Moles that should be examined by a dermatologist for melanoma are asymmetrical, have irregular borders, are



darker than usual or are changing color, have a diameter of more than a quarter inch, or are becoming raised or more raised than they used to be. Melanomas often appear on areas most exposed to the sun but can occur anywhere.

If you have been diagnosed with melanoma, there are a number of treatment options. The melanoma clinic at the University of Michigan Comprehensive Cancer Center offers diagnosis and treatment for skin cancer from a team of researchers and specialists in melanoma. SUNSCREEN SMARTS


1) If you buy a sunscreen or sun block, but apply less than what is recommended, you may be dramatically lowering the amount of protection you're getting. Sunscreen testers use about an ounce (about a shot glass full) of the stuff each time they go out. Don't forget your forehead, nose and the area around your eyes. If you have short hair or wear your hair pulled back, you'll need to pay attention to your ears and neck.

2) If you're really serious about protecting your skin, wear an SPF of 15 and above all the time. If you are fair, or have a family history of skin cancer, you may want to apply an SPF of 30 all the time.

3) FDA findings have proved that zinc oxide, that white stuff life guards wear on their noses, completely blocks UVB and UVA rays. 
PROTECT YOURSELF

Obviously, the best way to avoid skin cancer is to protect yourself from the sun, especially, Dr. Brandes says, if your ancestry is from Northern Europe. He suggests wearing sunblock with a protection of at least 25, and donning a hat and long sleeves if you know you'll be exposed.



SAFETY ON THE ROAD

Bike riding lets you enjoy the outdoors, provides a great mode of transportation that is inexpensive and environmentally safe, and it helps you stay physically fit. According to Michael Robold, director of Michigan Bicycle Touring near Traverse City, to really enjoy the benefits of biking, cyclists need to know the rules of the road. They publish a list of safety tips, which includes the following:

- *Keep your bike in excellent repair*, and get it serviced each year.
- *Obey the same traffic laws* as those for motor vehicles.
- *Signal by hand* when you are about to turn, slow down or stop.
- *Yield the right of way* to pedestrians.
- *Ride at a reasonable speed*, and keep control of your bike. When stopping, use both brakes simultaneously and gently; don't stab at them. On long downhills, pump your brakes.



- *Never ride against traffic.* Ride the same direction the traffic is going. Listen to motorized vehicles approaching from the rear and prepare to have them pass you.
- *Avoid metal grates*, potholes, glass or large objects in the road, and be careful of loose sand or gravel, particularly on corners and down hills.
- *Ride on bike paths* whenever possible.
- *Wear bright-colored clothing*, corrective glasses if you need them, sports shoes (not sandals), cycling gloves and protective eye wear. Use guard clips on trouser cuffs to prevent pants from getting caught in the front sprocket.
- *Avoid riding at dusk or after dark;* if you must ride in the evening, use a headlight, reflectors on the back and on the spokes, and wear reflective clothing or tape available in most sporting goods stores.
- *Keep alert* for cars that may turn or open their doors in front of you.
- *Never bicycle across railroad tracks.* Dismount and walk your bike across.
- *Use a package rack.* Don't carry packages that could block your view, and never carry them in one hand leaving only one hand to steer.
- *Don't carry passengers.*
- *Don't wear headphones* while riding. They will keep you from hearing traffic.

Always wear a helmet that meets federal testing standards and is brightly colored so you are visible to motorists. Robold says his group requires all tour bikers to wear

helmets. "It's just common sense," he says. "The head is vulnerable; and falling from the height you're at when you're biking can cause serious damage."

Make sure the helmet fits the head perfectly by trying on several models until you find one that's comfortable. Adjust the chin strap so the helmet rests level (not towards the back of the head) and doesn't slip when you shake your head.

Finally, ride a bike that fits you. Bicycles are more comfortable to ride these days because of improved suspensions and design, but in order to select the perfect bike, you need to consider the terrain you'll be riding on, your fitness level, the amount of time you'll spend on the bike, and your own comfort. "Just like buying a car or a major appliance, you need to shop around," Robold says. "Go to at least three different places and tell the sales people what your primary biking activity will be. This will help you determine a price range and style."

SKIN CARE FOR ATHLETES

Even the most competitive athletes can be sidelined by skin problems. Worrisome opponents for athletes are friction, perspiration and the sun. Some skin care tips from the American Skin Association can help you beat the odds.

- *Sun damage*-to avoid sun damage,

apply sunscreen with at least a 15 sun protection factor (SPF) and reapply it frequently when you perspire. Avoid direct sunlight during the middle of the day, when the sun's damaging ultra violet rays are strongest. Wear protective hats and clothing.

- *Calluses*-skin thickens when it is rubbed repeatedly, creating calluses. Eliminate the cause of the friction by trying different shoes or equipment. Trim the thickened skin or soak the area to soften the skin. Rub with a pumice stone when calluses build up.
- *Corns*-are a thickening of the outer layer of skin on toes or other bony areas of the feet. Poorly fitting shoes can be the culprit. Be sure they don't put pressure on bony areas. If a corn develops, treat it the same way as a callus. If it doesn't respond, seek professional help to apply a corn-removing chemical.
- *Friction blisters*-typically occur on the feet because of constant rubbing, heat and moisture. Make sure shoes fit properly. Regular removal of calluses can prevent blisters from developing. Severe blisters should be managed under the direction of your physician.
- *Tennis toe*-occurs when blood accu-

mulates under the toe nail and is caused by shoes that are too tight or have too tight a toe box. Allowing toenails to grow too long is another problem. Warm water soakings and rest can relieve the problem. If the condition is severe, get professional help to drain the blood under the nail.

- *Black heel*-a dark discoloration on the heel or palm is caused by bleeding between skin layers. These injuries are purely cosmetic and will disappear when you reduce your level of activity.
- *Acne mechanica*-is a result of irritation of the hair follicles by tight clothing. Wear absorbent cotton under clothing, especially under synthetic athletic wear. Change out of exercise clothes quickly. Wash vigorously with soap and a wash cloth.
- *Athlete's Foot*-occurs when chronic perspiration softens the outer skin and allows fungus infections to develop. Wear absorbent socks and apply foot powder or use an antifungal cream daily. Preparations prescribed by physicians with aluminum chloride are especially helpful in controlling sweating.

PLANNING A NURTURING NURSERY

Soon you'll be bringing home your new baby, and you want to ensure that the nursery is comfortable and safe. Here are some tips:

- If your home was built before 1978, have your paint checked for lead. Remove any lead paint or cover it with an approved sealant before adding new paint or wallpaper.
- Avoid thick, cushy carpet: it hides dirt, food, small objects and dust mites. Clean, washable floors are preferable to area rugs that can skid.
- Keep lamps, lighting fixtures and electrical wires out of reach, and use safety covers on all electric outlets.
- Use a crib that meets safety standards. Slats should be no more than 2 3/8 inches apart. Make sure latches can't unlatch accidentally. Corner posts should extend no more than 5/8 of an inch above the side rail. Also, place the crib away from heat sources, windows and any hanging cords.
- Check that no more than two fingers can fit between the edge of the mattress and sides of the crib, and that the mattress is at least 26 inches below the top rails of the drop side, to keep babies in.

- Use cloth or vinyl bumper pads to protect the baby's head. As soon as your child can pull himself up, remove the pads.
- Avoid crib toys with small parts that might break off as well as anything with strings.
- Use a changing table with safety straps.

Recent data proves that babies should sleep on their backs to avoid Sudden Death Syndrome (SDS). And, NEVER put a pillow in the crib; it can suffocate your child.

GETTING YOUR KIDS INTO THE SWIM OF THINGS

Swimming is a great way for kids to cool off, splash around, play games with each other and enjoy these hot summer days. In order to safely enjoy swimming, children need to be acclimated to the water, says Julie Sommers, aquatic director for the Livonia Family YMCA. They also should learn the fundamentals of swimming, along with rules for safety.



FIRST SPLASH

Babies under the age of one can be introduced to water in a safe environment, such as your bathtub or a shallow wading pool in the backyard. When introducing an infant or toddler to the water, make sure the water temperature is not below 82 degrees. Babies lose body heat more easily than older children and can become chilled more quickly.

Gently splash or rub water against your child's skin, and watch to see if he enjoys the sensation. You and your child also can play games with rubber floating toys.



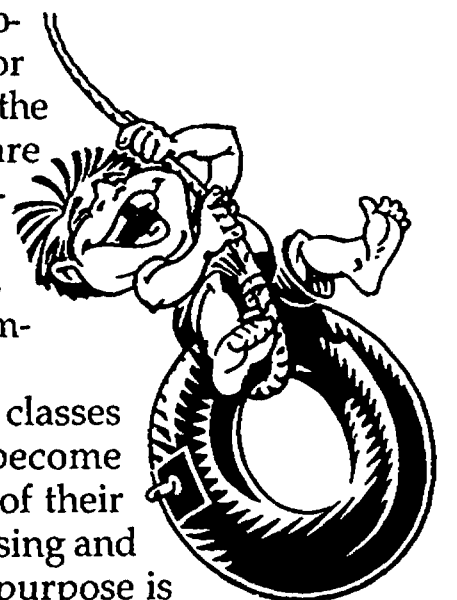
Parents also can carry babies gently, but securely, into a swimming pool, holding them

upright, so they can feel what it's like to be suspended in the water. Keep the head above water, let the child move their arms and legs around and splash if they want to. This experience will help them gain confidence later when they learn to swim.

WATER PLAY

Organized water familiarization programs, such as those designed for infants, toddlers and preschoolers by the American Red Cross and YMCA, are another way to help your child develop an early appreciation of swimming. These programs are informal, fun and they teach children to feel comfortable in shallow water.

The Livonia Family YMCA offers classes for six-month olds, where kids become adjusted to the water with the help of their parents or another caregiver. "They sing and play games," Sommers says. "The purpose is

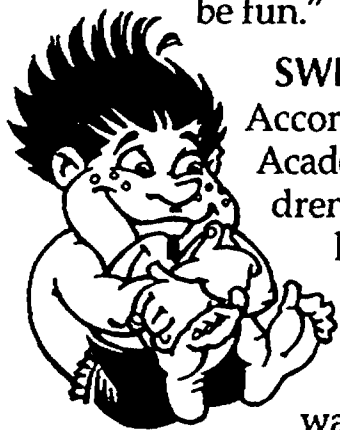

SWIMMING LESSONS

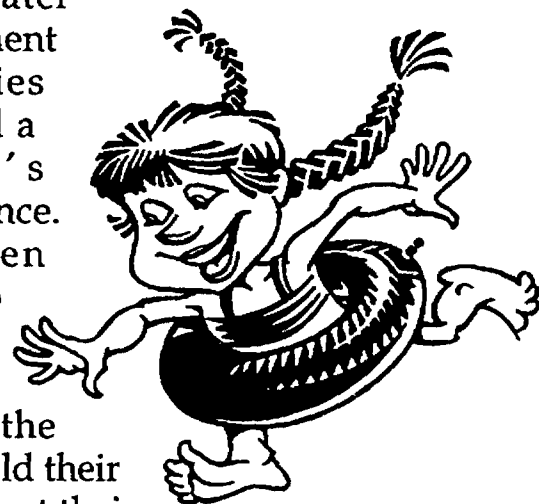
According to the American Academy of Pediatrics, children can begin swim lessons when they are about three years of age, providing they are comfortable in the water and want to learn

how to swim. Never force your child to take lessons before he or she is ready. It's a good idea to enroll your child in group lessons, where children learn proper swimming strokes, are given safety instructions, and can enjoy playing in the water.

Sommers says the YMCA has a special safety day where life jackets are demonstrated, kids learn basic safety rules like not running near the pool, and they understand the role of the lifeguard.

A typical beginning swim class starts

with water adjustment activities to build a child's confidence. Children learn to jump off the side of the pool, hold their breath, put their



head in water, and do a forward paddle stroke. At this early stage, children need the freedom to explore how their bodies interact with the water and develop some control over their movements. Over time, children are taught the back float, the backstroke, the front crawl, and eventually in more advanced classes, the sidestroke and breaststroke.

SAFETY RULES

To keep your child safe, whether it's in your backyard pool, or in a lake, the American Academy of Pediatrics offers the following tips:

- Teach your child these basic safety rules and make sure they obey them:

- 1) **Never swim alone.**
- 2) **Never dive into water except when permitted by an adult who knows the depth of the water.**
- 3) **Always use a U.S. Coast Guard-approved life vest when fishing, riding in a boat, or playing in a river or stream.**

- **Never** let your child swim without adult supervision.
- **Make sure** the adult watching your child knows how to swim, get emergency help, and perform CPR.
- **Don't let** young children who can not swim use inflatable toys or mattresses in water that is above their waist.

- **Avoid** the use of air-filled swimming aids. They are not a substitute for life vests and can suddenly deflate or become detached from your children during play.
- **Remove** all toys from the pool after your child comes out. This way, they won't be tempted to reach for them and fall in the pool by accident.
- **Keep** a life preserver and a shepherd's hook (any long pole with a hook on the end) in the pool area to help pull a child to the edge of the pool, if necessary.

If you have a standard-size swimming pool in your yard, completely surround it with fence that is at least four feet high, and make sure fence gates are self-closing and self-latching. Also, follow these poolside safety tips:

- **Never** let the kids run or engage in horseplay near the pool where water makes surfaces slippery.
- **No one** should swim during a thunder or lightning storm.
- **Be sure** to sanitize your pool regularly to kill harmful bacteria.

IN GOOD SWIM CLASSES:



- The teacher is nationally certified as a swim instructor and life guard by a group such as the American Red Cross or the YMCA, and has training in first aid and CPR.

- The ratio of children to instructor is low enough for each child to receive individual attention.
- The facilities are clean, and the pool is heated.
- A lifeguard is on duty at all times.
- Children enjoy themselves!



"The most important part of a swim instructor's job is patience," Sommers says. "Children learn at different speeds and we need to work slowly and gradually with each child to build trust. The idea is to make swimming a positive experience." ■

HELP FOR AGING EYES

You may have realized every time you grab your glasses to find numbers in the phone book or to read the newspaper, that your eyes are aging along with the rest of you. One out of every four people over 65 have clinical evidence of age-related macular degeneration (AMD), the most common form of irreversible blindness in the U.S., and the cause of visual impairment for about 20 percent of individuals over 75.

The aging is inevitable, but there are ways to keep your eyes healthy:

- **Eat plenty of carotenoid-rich food.**

Apparently what they say about rabbits never wearing glasses is true. The Center for Science in the Public Interest recently cited foods containing high amounts of lutein, such as spinach or kale, as promising in the prevention of AMD. Vitamins A and E and the trace elements selenium and zinc are recommended as well. And, yes, carrots are also good for your eyes.

- **Keep you eyes out of the sun.** Damage due to harmful ultraviolet light can significantly affect eye health. Be sure to wear sunglasses that block UV rays, and you may want to try wrap-arounds that not only filter out direct rays, but protect you from rays that angle in from the sides.

- **Wear hats with a brim.** The less direct light striking your eyes the better.

- **Avoid cigarettes.** People who smoke have an increased risk of developing AMD.

- **Reduce alcohol consumption.** Alcohol may deplete the level of antioxidants and carotenoids in the body. Men should have no more than two to six drinks of alcohol a week, while women should limit intake to one to three drinks a week.

FIXING YOUR HOUSE TO HELP PREVENT FALLS

As people age, the risk of sustaining an injury from a fall increases dramatically. One in three adults over the age of 65 falls each year, making this type of injury the most common hazard among seniors.

Although a person at any age can experience



a fall, the elderly are at a higher risk of injury and tend to be more seriously affected. Any condition that limits a person's agility or impedes his or her balance may cause a fall. Arthritis, stiff joints, weak muscles or bones, dizziness, loss of vision and disorientation can all cause a loss of balance and interfere with a person's stability. Add to that drugs given for heart disease, high blood pressure, diabetes and stroke, and coordination problems get worse.

ENVIRONMENTAL FACTORS CONTRIBUTE, AS WELL.

Places that may be safe for most people can present hazards for seniors; such as the bathroom and kitchen, where spills and slippery surfaces are common; and on the stairs, where lighting and handrails are not always adequate.

To prepare your house to help prevent falls, try the following:

- To make your bathroom safer, you can add bathtub rails and wall grab bars in the shower to help you get in and out. Slip-resistant mats on the bottom of the bathtub can help prevent falls in the tub. Using a bath/shower seat or a transfer bench plus hand-held shower spray makes showering easy for someone who has difficulty standing for an extended period of time. A safety

frame around the toilet can lend support to someone who is unsteady, and a raised toilet seat can help someone who has difficulty bending and sitting.

- To help safeguard your kitchen, wipe up spills, water and grease immediately and thoroughly. Be sure to keep floors free of food and crumbs. Keep shelves and storage areas within easy reach and purchase reacher devices for getting things off high shelves. You may think about installing washable, cushioned linoleum in your kitchen to soften a fall.
- Stairways should always be well-lit and carpeted. Mount handrails to both sides of the stairs for added security. Fasten edges of floor coverings with heavy-duty adhesive tape and avoid using area rugs in walkways. Cords and wires should be kept clear of all traffic areas and should be fastened to the walls.
- Make sure your home is well lit. Place night lights along the route from the bedroom to the bathroom and leave one on in the bathroom at night. Always turn on a light before entering a room to avoid bumping into objects, and light all indoor and outdoor walk ways. ■■

MAKING PEACE WITH PASTA

The big news these days is that protein is in and pasta is out. If you've been reading about "The Zone" by Barry Sears, or Dr. Atkins new "Diet Revolution," you'll find recommendations for a high protein, low carbohydrate diet as the most efficient way to lose weight. But, according to Nancy Jacobi, registered dietitian with Sinai Hospital, that's not the way to go. "The American Dietetic Association recommends a well balanced diet as the best defense against weight problems," she says, explaining that a diet that derives 50 to 60 percent of its calories from carbohydrates, 20 percent from protein and less than 30 percent from fat is the one approved by the American Heart Association.

So, we shouldn't blame rigatoni, fettuccine and spaghetti for making us fat. In fact:

- *Carbohydrates don't keep you from reaching your peak performance "zone."*

A constant supply of carbohydrates is vital for exercise performance, as well as weight management and optimal health. Active people should consume 60 percent of their daily calories from carbohydrates. One reason: They are the sole source of glycogen, a starch that's stored in your liver and muscles, which is released into your bloodstream as glucose while you exercise.

- *Pasta in itself is almost fat free.*

The total fat and calorie count of a pasta dish depends on the other ingredients, Jacobi says. For example, compare fettuccine Alfredo, which is made with eggs, cream and cheese, with a marinara recipe made from tomato sauce with fresh basil.

- *Pasta doesn't cause insulin resistance, a condition in which insulin levels rise, leading to weight gain.*

People who have this condition produce too much insulin in response to the rise in blood sugar after a meal. In theory, this insulin rise causes more carbohydrates to be stored as fat than burned for energy. But eating pasta doesn't lead to this condition, being overweight does. Likewise, cutting back on carbohydrates doesn't solve the problem for heavy people. What does? Dieting and exercise.

- *Low-fat foods that are high in calories can lead to weight gain.*

But, a diet high in naturally fat free (and relatively low calorie) food like pasta won't put on the pounds.

PASTA COOKING TIPS

To get the most health benefits from your pasta dishes, try the following:

- To keep sodium low, don't add salt when cooking the pasta. If you want more flavor, add a peeled, quartered onion to the pot. Save some of the cooking water, which you can use to thin the sauce.
- Tip the balance of ingredients in favor of vegetables. Add meat in small amounts.
- When using prepared sauces for your pasta, check the label and opt for the lowest fat versions.
- Use higher-fat foods, such as oil, cheese and olives, in small amounts. Use sharp-flavored cheese and shred or grate it to make a small amount go further.
- Add zesty flavor with low-fat foods such as garlic, herbs, red pepper and anchovies. Cook garlic briefly to take the edge off its rawness. To release their flavors, crumble dried herbs between your fingers as you

add them to the pot.

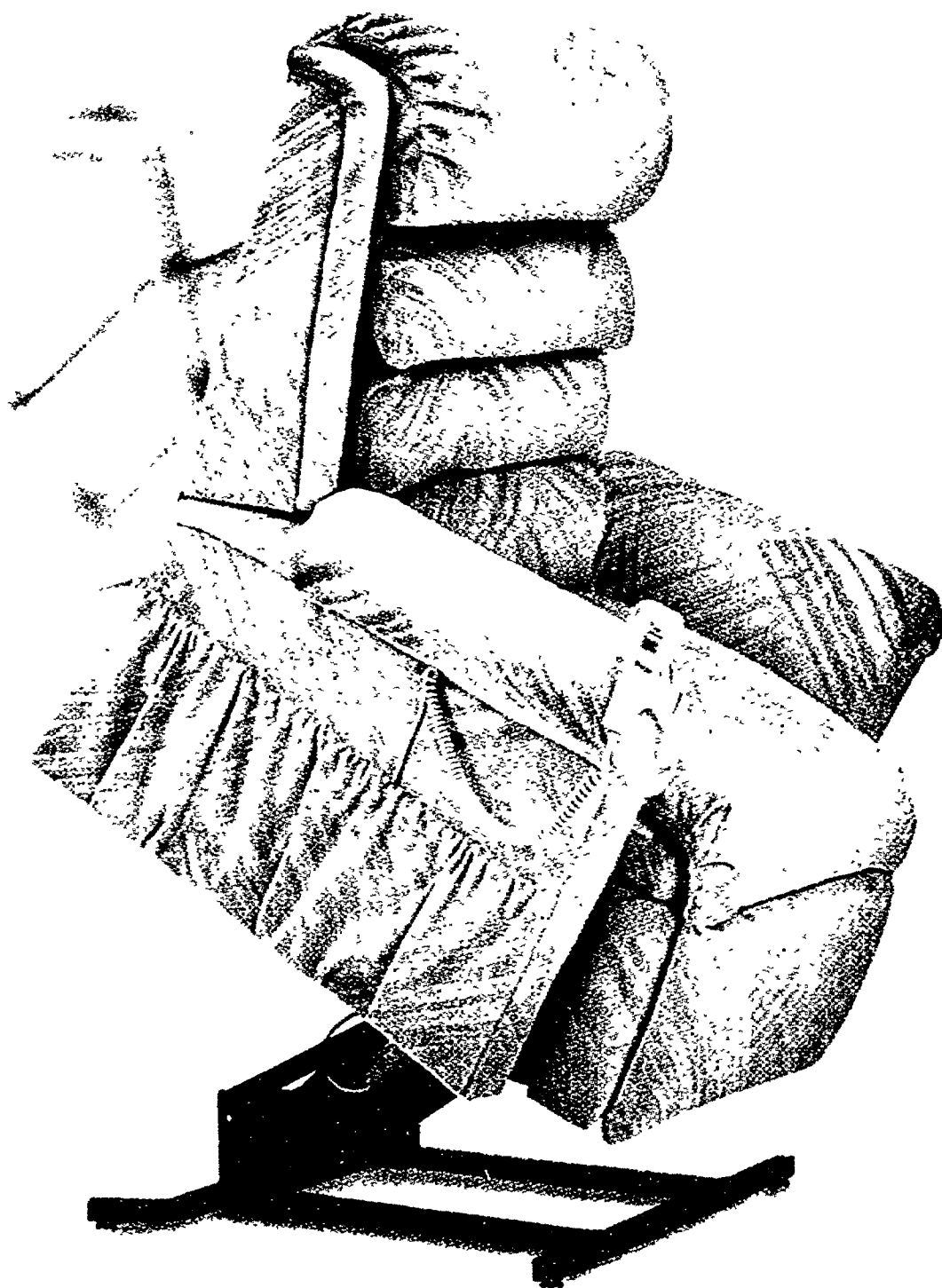
