## Nield, Gudritz to seek reelection to board

It's a lot of work, but it's worth the money, in my opinion. And according to school superintendent Leonard Reznarski, an individual up to the challenge of serving on the Northville school board will not be in many years.

Two seats on the board are up for grabs on the June 8 ballot, and all 11 places in 12 signatures to get in the running.

Incumbents Tom Gudritz and Marilyn Nield have announced that they plan to seek reelection and

have already begun to fill their petitions with signatures. Only one other person has requested a petition so far, that individual is not identified here or herself to school officials. All registered voters who are over the age of 18 and live in the district are eligible to run for the two hot seats.

Deadline for the petitions is April 6 at 4 p.m.

According to Reznarski, the next few years promise to bring great change to the district as the new high school block schedule, its state-mandated foreign language establishes, and its computer technology is implemented. Construction of a brand new high school and remodeling projects at every school in the district are also on the agenda.

## Township officials OK gravel mine agreement

After years of back and forth negotiations, Angelo Liferati Construction Company finally won its case to enter into an agreement with Northville Township to operate a gravel mine at the southeast corner of Six Mile and Ridge Roads.

With no asterisk attached, that asterisk was the issue of allowing Liferati to run the business as a subsidiary — in issue Liferati would have been the township's zoning, he had appeals to secure. **You Auto Know**

**WARNING TO THE TASK?**  
Conventional wisdom used to be that an engine should be allowed to warm up for several minutes before driving out of the driveway in the morning. A long, drag on up however is no longer recommended for modern engines, which along with the rest of a drivetrain warm up more quickly when driven upon their starting. Moreover, because the combustion process is less efficient when the engine is cold, allowing the car to warm up slowly releases more carbonized fuel into the motor. It then is necessary that the recommendation is to allow a cold engine to idle only until the oil pressure comes into its normal range. A few seconds before driving away at moderate speed until the engine reaches its normal operating temperature.

# Twp. fire department softens up

## Target donates 100 teddy bears to help calm distraught youngsters

Without so much as an inter-view 100 new recruits were pro-moted within the Northville Town-ship fire department.

Only 10 minutes the recruits could fit in your hand and double as a pillow.

That's because the recruits are teddy bears and according to Sgt. Tim Cowher the service they pro-vide is second to none.

Each and every time that we've given a teddy bear to a youngster you could see the relief in their eyes. Cowher said Mom and dad don't wear firefighter clothes and it can be pretty scary so we've been handing out the teddy bears to teach kids that firefighters are their friends.

Cowher explained that firefight-

ing and rescue personnel across the country have been making a concerted effort in recent years to teach youngsters that despite the intimidating gear they wear fire-fighters need not be feared.

The township fire department had been purchasing teddy bears for the last eight years before the manufacturer stopped producing their "forests" the township to seek an alternative.

Solution? Donation. In this case from Northville's Target.

Team relations leader Patty Ryzdewski said the teddy bear donation program has been going on for the better part of five years. It's an initiative put on by the entire Target organization. They're called the Hugs & Kisses bears.

Right now we're just dealing with Northville Township but we

expect to have a working relation-ship with the city of Northville sometime in the near future," she said.

More than 200 of the stuffing filled bears have been given out since the program was put in place.

Since forming the partnership with Target, Cowher said he's already had the chance to hand out one of the teddy bears to a child who took a nasty tumble

from a shopping cart. The pres-ence of the teddy bear provided ample comfort to the child while medical personnel were able to tend to the injury.

It was a big boo boo, Cowher said. But it comforted the child and gave us the chance to take care of the medical issues.

# Smoke detector stirs sleeping man while home burns

A smoke detector may very well have been the difference between life and death for a Ridge Road resident whose home suffered \$200,000 in damage from a fire last week.

Chief Bill Zhemdak said a Northville Township fire official received a call at around 6:10 reporting an electrical fire on a Ridge Road home between Six and Seven Mile Roads.

Zhemdak said the location of the home was critical as many homes in the southwestern portion of the Township — including the one which was on fire — aren't hooked into a water system and instead have stand alone water and septic tanks.

It does make things a little bit different when you don't have access to fire hydrants," Zhemdak said.

Because of the extent of the fire 19 firefighters from both the Township's stations were called to the scene as were six vehicles including a second tanker truck from the Salem Township fire department.

Once at the home Zhemdak said he was relieved to see the only occupant of the home standing outside of the home. Heavy smoke could be seen coming from the attic.

The home was valued at \$140,000.

It's such a nice feeling to see

that the only person in the home is safe, outside," he said. "The number one thing we want to ensure is that no one gets hurt."

The man told authorities he was stirred by the home's smoke detector which was loud enough not to allow him to fall asleep.

He said that once he got a mouthful of smoke he realized he was in trouble. "Zhemdak said

Authorities from Detroit Edison were contacted to arrange a disconnection of the electrical supply to the home. Not doing so Zhemdak said would have created an extremely dangerous mixture of water and electricity.

The combined departments had a total of 9,000 gallons of water on hand to fight the blaze, but Zhemdak said the trucks left the scene with a good amount of water still in reserve.

Most of the damage was confined to the home's bathroom and living room.

Zhemdak said preliminary investigations into the cause of the blaze pointed to a short circuit in the electrical water heater of the house.

Just the same Zhemdak said the fire served as a reminder to homeowners to test their smoke detectors once a month and to replace smoke detector batteries when changing from Standard to Daylight Savings time and vice versa.

Daylight savings time returns to the U.S. at 2 a.m. April 5.

# Appeals court knocks down barrier to weapons records

Fred Mager is inching closer toward obtaining Michigan State Police pistol inspection records.

The state Court of Appeals recently denied the State Police's request for a rehearing. The court ruled 3-0 that the Redford Township resident was entitled under the Freedom of Information Act to the records.

My attorney, Daniel Bunkley of DeWitt has a date in Ingham Circuit Court for summary disposition, said Mager, who wants the records in order to enlist pistol owners in a campaign for less restrictive laws.

Time is critical, said Mager, the

Meanwhile four state representatives introduced a bipartisan package of bills aimed at uniform standards for issuing a concealed weapons permit. The group includes Alan Cropper, R-DeWitt, sponsor of

an earlier failed bill to have a single state gun permit system. Co-sponsors include Democrats Candace Curtis of Swartz Creek and Howard Wetters of Bay County and Republican James McNitt, a former Midland County sheriff.

"Cropper" walked in to the law enforcement lobby, Mager said.

He pointed to a section that would allow county gun boards to go behind closed doors to pore over an applicant's mental health records.

Michigan is secrecy with gun laws," he said.

The new package says applicants must be at least 21 years old, be a Michigan resident at least one year complete a 12 hours firearms training course and have no felonies or

violent misdemeanors on their records.


The license must never have been acquired for a crime by reason of insanity and not under a court order of legal incapacity or involuntary commitment.

A licensee with .02 percent blood alcohol content caught carrying a

weapon could have his permit revoked. "Ridiculous! A pilot can fly a 747 with a higher content," said Mager.

On the other side, one bill would exempt a person with a CCW (many concealed weapons permit from having to obtain a pistol purchase permit and a safety inspection.



# District buys 12 new buses, seeks more drivers

## New buses roll into district tagging along a hefty price

A brand new shiny yellow school bus costs \$55,770.  
That's a sizable chunk of change, especially multiplied by 12.  
But the Northville Public School District was able to afford the \$700,000 purchase of a dozen new buses to add to the district fleet thanks to the \$61.5 million bond issue passed by voters last year.  
The new 18-ton diesel buses rolled into town last month equipped with non-skid ABS brakes, advanced safety systems and features like Air Ride suspension that make for more comfortable cruising.

I had one of the old ones. It was slower and non-dependable. You jog around in a bus all day and you can feel it. 10-year driver Jackie Hunter said.  
Nancy Gunningham, a district driver for three years also noticed a smoother ride.  
I love the suspension because I have all country roads every one of them. Now you don't notice the bumps. The kids seem to really enjoy the new bus. They used to know where all the bumps were and brace themselves six feet. It seems quieter now.  
Other new features include better lumbar back support in the driver's seat and dashboards that

are higher, more compact and better lit.  
Drivers also cite larger mirrors as an improvement which allows them to keep a closer eye on their precious cargo.  
We can see all of the bus now but the kids can't figure out how we see them, Hunter said. "The kids are sensitive to every change in the new buses. They were so excited you could just see it."  
To meet the public schools' transportation needs, the district needs 28 buses, plus four or five backup spares. Early deliveries of the vehicles that were ordered last June means the buses leased from Hooker's Truck in Troy can be

returned.  
Buses owned by the district the oldest dating back to 1988 will be cannibalized for parts.  
Even though the new buses will need less repair, taking care of the fleet will still be a lot of work for head mechanic Larry Wild and his assistant John Bajajowski.  
We have some bugs to work out. That's problems with any new vehicle. Maintenance, service, fueling and so forth. It's a full-time job, Wild said.  
An average bus is driven about 20,000 miles each year to ferry kids in and from school field trips and sporting events.

## Buses are safety equipped, without air bags or seat belts

**By WENDY WHITE Staff Writer**  
The district's new buses have advanced safety systems though they lack seat belts or air bags.  
That's because the development of air bags for school buses has not been initiated yet, according to assistant superintendent Dave Bolitto.  
State law says that seat belts are not required and not desired, Bolitto said. The time it would take to release students could cost students and drivers their lives.  
If seat belts were installed in student seats, a full time yard would need to be hired for each bus to make sure students kept them fastened and to assist in unfastening them in case of an emergency.  
You may have incidents where seat belts would help kids other

incidents where they would harm kids so we don't know. We're not going to do it until crash tests show definitely, Bolitto said.  
He cited crash tests that have found the high padded seat backs break the impact of an student who is thrown forward in collisions.  
Usually when you have a crash the bus wins, so the impact is not usually felt. Therefore this padding is deemed sufficient, he said.  
However, laws do require safety glass, flashing lights and distinct markings which the new buses comply with.  
The buses are equipped with ceiling escape hatches, emergency windows on both sides, stop arms and eight light systems with roof strobes that are activated when the bus stops, Bolitto said.

## Retired drivers stepping in to fill immediate need

The ranks of Northville Public School bus drivers are stretched so thin employees are working double shifts and retired drivers are being called back to fill in the gaps.  
Retirees are currently working every day. David Bolitto, assistant superintendent said. If we didn't have them we'd be out of business. The need for substitute drivers is very critical.  
Being a bus driver may not seem glamorous but it will make you part of a 40 plus member family.  
We have fun here, said driver Nancy Gunningham who's been employed in the district's transportation department for three years.  
We're desperately in need. We will train them here and it's easier than they think. Anyone can do it. It's a good job for homemakers because you get summer and vacations off. Gunningham said.  
Becoming a bus driver entails getting tested at the county level and putting in 30 hours on the road to obtain a commercial driver's license.  
Drivers also learn safety, vehicle controls and are required take driving and knowledge tests.  
New drivers usually start with four-hour shifts, split between morning and afternoon routes. Pay starts at \$10.91 and rises to \$12.34 after 120 days.

# City resident reappointed to state commission

## Colling in charge of organizing response in case of chemical accident

For most people, it's a bunch of a challenge rumbering not to mix Roman Cleanser and Clorox in the process of cleaning a house.

That, or finding the perfect ratio of baking soda and vinegar for the infamous volcano science project.

For Marcelle Colling, a resident of Northville for 23 years, the stakes are infinitely more severe when you're talking about chlorine gas leaks or petroleum spills. But that's her job.

Colling was recently reappointed to her position as a member of the Michigan Emergency Planning and Community Right to Know Commission.

Long name? Sure. But the agency's purpose is to verify that worst case scenario plans set up by local authorities in the event of a chemical accident are actually implemented.

To do that, chemical companies need to check in with Colling's office and keep them in the loop of the sorts of products manufactured.

Colling has been on the job since the agency formed in 1988. If it sounds like it's job compatible to emergency preparedness in the wake of a natural disaster, you're right, according to Colling.

The plans for chemicals and the plans for acts of God are pretty much the same. Colling said. You need to get people to a safe area and try to contain and isolate the damage, then repair it as quickly as can safely be done.

Colling's job was first filled by the state's first female legislator at Central Michigan University in Jackson, Michigan. The accident killed more than 2,500 people and was the worst industrial accident in U.S. history.

Colling is the director of Environmental Health and Safety at Kettering University, formerly General Motors Institute.

Before jumping into the chemical world, she spent 12 years working at steel producer in Jackson, Michigan. Fortunately, the bad times have been few and far between, but there have been situations in which Colling's preparation came to the fore.

Recently a Colling-supervised plan was put into action in November of 1996 when a truck derailed near Highland, Michigan, leaking potentially dangerous chemicals.

It was handled very well, she said. That's the whole idea behind this organization. We want to eliminate the possibility of people or property getting hurt.

But to make sure a plan on paper will actually work in real life, emergency response crews should full-blown dress rehearsals from time to time to find the weak links in disaster relief.

Don't so gives crews a chance to see what was done well and what could have been done more efficiently.

We certainly don't want anyone to get hurt, nor do we want property to be damaged, so these exercises help keep us on top of things, she said.

## Cooke moving plans take shape

It's a school that threatens to swallow its students. Five miles of Northville High school will soon be torn down before the middle schools who will be transferred there for the 2000 01 school year.

That's when the new Northville High School will open on Six Mile and the conversion of its former site on Center Street into a middle school will be complete.

This building, which is built to be a middle school. It's a lot larger than most middle schools. It's a little more spread out said Cooke principal Dr. Jeff Rudowski. But in ways it's exciting because there's going to be so much space that we can use to create programs that we can't do here.

Rudowski said in order to establish an intimate setting, design to me envision creating. It's all within a school. Grade levels will be confined to zones in which it can track the teacher to make like atmospheres.

The current blueprint shows sixth graders housed at the front of the school, seventh graders in the current English wing and eighth graders in an area now reserved for science and social studies classes.

Design teams also envision a virtual indoor zoo where Cooke's extensive animal collection will be displayed in ventilated greenhouses with windows lining the halls.

Other schools will be invited to view the animals and students will be trained as docents. I lead them in an hour.

Rudowski said he hopes to use the extra space to create a senior citizen walking track around the school. By opening, the halls before classes begin in the morning, senior walkers can get their morning exercise at the school instead of at the mall. We have a senior citizen prom here every year and

we've established a relationship with about 150 seniors. Rudowski said. The Life Skills kids will make rolls and coffee for them and do some elbow rubbing with our seniors. We want them to be a part of our school.

But with all the opportunities the relatively huge building offers, it also presents some challenges. Middle Schools are usually constructed with the library at their center but at Northville High it is tucked away in a corner.

Also, few grassy areas around the school mean kids will have to cross the overpass above Baseline Road to get to recreational areas after lunch.

However, a larger cafeteria means space can be partitioned off for game tables and ping pong. The gym will also be open after lunch.

If we get more parent volunteers we can do more with the kids during lunch hour. Rudowski said. Another challenge that design teams face is traffic congestion. Traffic is already a problem in the narrow driveway leading to the high school's main entrance. With more parents driving their children to school it's expected to get worse.

But with design teams made up of parents, staff and administrators working together, Rudowski said he hopes many of these problems can be solved before the new millennium begins.

First on the agenda, he said, is deciding on a new name. Please give us an identity. Rudowski implored the school board, who recently voted that school names must reflect geographical or geological features and not individuals.

"This is one of the most exciting things to come up in my career," Rudowski said. "It's such a massive building but a place where we can encourage self-esteem and a place that'll look like a middle school as soon as kids hit the door."

mining/striping plan in 1992 sparking a lawsuit that Lafraite inherited when it bought the parcel from the Holloway firm in 1991. A court settlement recently settled the dispute.

The new agreement at between the township and Lafraite is set to be finalized this week. Since that time, it has caused for Lafraite and the township exchanged several agreements that required time for the proposed agreement was brought to the board last week.

The one stumbling block whether Lafraite would be allowed to continue its mining Saturday. For the board's part, members stressed that hours of operation during the regular work week had already been reduced by permitting Lafraite to do business from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Trustee Russ Fogg, and clerk Sue Hillbrand voted against the agreement.

But from Lafraite's perspective, Greene told the board that a gravel mining operation should be given the same treatment as any other industrial activity in the township and thus be given the Saturday hours per week granted by the township to allow Lafraite to run its business without a major interruption by having a greater number of days of operation available to the company.

He also indicated Lafraite needed to begin making its preparations soon if the company was to take advantage of the relatively short warm weather building season.

About a month, Greene said, the mine would only be operating during part of the year from the soonest practical day after the lifting of Michigan's frost laws to October. Greene said the possibility existed under certain permitting that the mine might operate later into the year but would certainly cease operation by the Christmas holidays.

Greene also pointed out that the township's zoning ordinance did not provide specific guidelines for Saturday operation but did that protective provisions would be put in place for the potential cessation of Saturday business if problems arose from it.

When asked if Lafraite would consider taking their Saturday hours use before Wayne County Circuit Court if the appeals board denied their request, Greene said he had no conversation with Lafraite executives regarding that option and wasn't certain of the possible alternate plans.

Greene said the weekend hours were a necessity if the company would be able to contribute material to such projects as the expansion of Detroit Metropolitan Airport and reconstruction of Michigan's roads.

Letters from Wayne County and Michigan Department of Transportation authorities verified that Saturday business is becoming part of the norm, Greene said.

If these days are working on Saturdays then they need their supplies, Greene said. In this industry, our customers operate on Saturdays. If we're to get those jobs, we need to be in a position to supply materials.

When asked Greene said Lafraite wouldn't necessarily be operating every Saturday. He said such week end work would depend on the

needs of the job in question.

Greene also said the mine would not generate an significant amount of additional truck traffic on township roads. This he said was confirmed in a study that found a maximum of 12 trucks on the road at any one time and at that only for time periods less than an hour per day.

At that level it was comparable to most other industrial businesses.

With regard to the effect trucks could have on noise levels to township director of Public Safety, Chip Sander said, loaded vehicles usually weren't the ones that caused headaches.

It's the empty trucks on bad roads that create the largest amount of noise, Sander said.

Once the mining is completed, Greene told the board that holes approximately 20 to 40 feet deep would be left behind from the digging.

Before any digging would be done, Lafraite will be responsible for doing a number of pieces of preparatory work including the paving of Ridge Road, Greene said.

The Lafraite Company has or is operating other locations in Oxford, Rochester and White Lake and has holdings outside of metro Detroit and in several states, Greene said. Lafraite had never received a complaint regarding Saturday operations at those locations.

The Saturday operations issue will be placed on the zoning board of appeal's April 6 meeting.

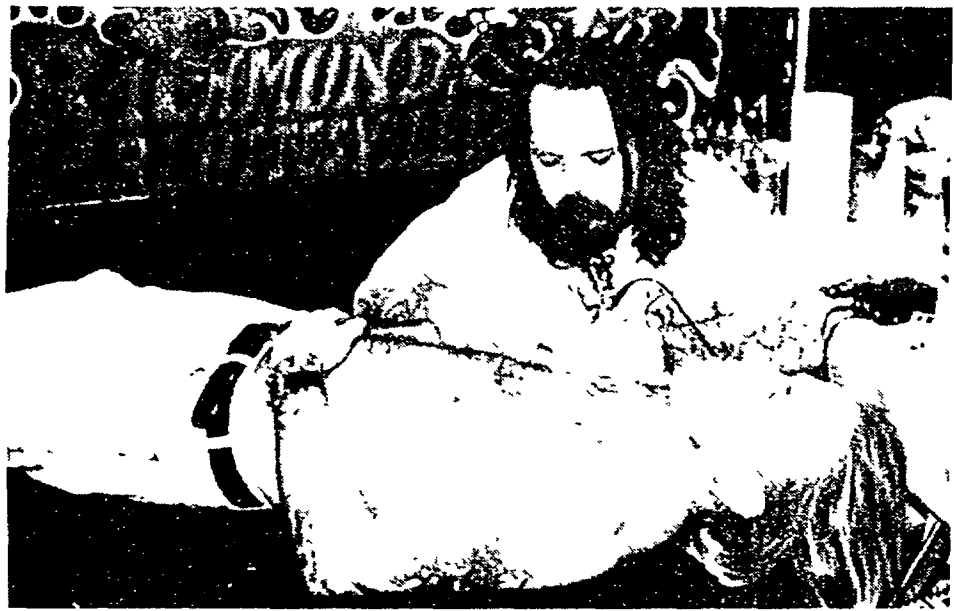

A dream of a lifetime was finally realized years later when he sailed once again this time as a pampered passenger aboard various freighters.

Inventive and resourceful, he founded a club for seniors called "Gray matters" where people could gather to solve concerns and problems or just sit and talk.

He loved picnics at Mill Race Village and meandering the quiet streets of Northville. He suited up proudly in his formal Edwardian attire complete with top hat and gentleman's walking stick when he attended the Victorian Ball.

In the early 1980s he walked in the historic Civil Rights march down Woodward Avenue with the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr.

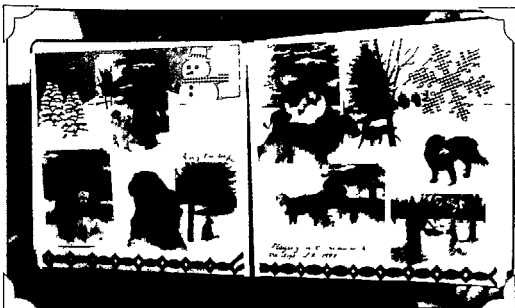

## From shoebox to Showpiece

Creating your own scrapbook is a great way to preserve special memories

**H**ow many shoe boxes do you have? Now how many of those boxes have photos not stored in them?

Scrapbooking a craze that has been building ever the last decade has been mushrooming in Northville and Novi.

Caryl Goodman a nail technician and Novi resident heard about photo scrapbooking about two and half years ago and couldn't wait to sign up as a consultant with Creative Memories because she loved the concept.

Creative Memories has been around for 10 years and has 33 000 consultants in the U.S., Canada and Mexico. They specialize in home educational classes in scrapbooking.

I also had 20 years of photos in boxes she said. I'm not completely finished yet I'm still working on my current pictures and then I go back and work on my older ones as well.

Goodman has since given up all her other crafts. As a Creative Memories consultant she educates her students about safe photo keeping so that pictures will last through generations.

It is a huge trend she said. We are having to educate people about the importance of acid free lignin free [products].

### A glossary of terms

**Lignin** - A naturally occurring substance that exists in wood. When wood is broken down into paper lignin is a residue that is left in the paper can cause the paper to break down over time.

**Acid-free** - A pH of 7.0 or above.

**PVC (Polyvinyl Chloride)** - A polymer used in some albums that can release gasses causing rapid severe damage to photographs.

Ninety percent of house holds own a camera and 10 billion pictures are taken a year according to Goodman.

I've talked to ladies who have never put pictures in albums," Goodman said. They've had them in shoe boxes for 20 years. So it is a big job for them.

Goodman and Mary Buck have who co owns Stampedder Plus in Northville with her husband Bob advise beginners to break the job down into smaller parts. Start by sorting photos into categories such as themes like wedding prom graduation holidays and birthdays or by children chronologically. Begin tackling the scrap booking project with the most recently taken photos first. Then work backwards to get caught up.

People can be very specific or can be general," Buckhaves said. Buckhaves became interested in scrapbooking when she wanted to put together a photo album for her son's high school graduation in 1996.

"His baby book was ruined by the wrong scotch tape and the photos did not look so hot," she said.

She put the new album together and had it available for all the guests at the graduation party to view.

"Family and friends really enjoyed looking at it," she said. Buckhaves began stocking scrapbooking supplies at the Stampeddler about a year ago.

"More and more people came in asking for stickers and supplies," Mary said. They were buying them by the basketful."

Wondering what they were up to she ask them one customer brought in an album for her too look at.

It was a natural extension of the stamping," Mary said of adding the scrapbooking supplies.

Supplies include templates stickers decorative scissors stamps die cuts ink markers inks that will not fade idea books and trimmers.

Products used in the albums should all be acid free lignin free pH balanced and PVC free.

The worst photo album to have are your pictures in is the magnetic style according to Goodman. It doesn't contain magnets but its cardboard pages are covered with a sticky adhesive coating covered with a plastic sheet.

"If your pictures are stored in a shoe box they are a whole lot better than stored

in a magnetic album Goodman said. The acid in the cardboard and the caustic glue actually migrate and accelerate the deterioration of your photos.

Goodman advises those that have difficulty removing photos from a magnetic album to try running dental floss in between the photo and the cardboard sheet or using a hair dryer.

Scrapbooking combines photos with artwork even mementos.

You don't have to be creative to come up with ideas for page design. Idea books give suggestions on layout and designs.

Goodman's daughter did a cruise album. After trimming a photo she cut footprints from the remaining water scene in the photo which track across the page.

People become much better photo takers after starting to do scrapbooking like this Goodman said. Because they know that a far off scene with a little bit of silhouette of a person is not meaningful.

Goodman and Stampeddler Plus in Northville offer stampbooking classes. The classes start at about \$10 to \$15 as well as all day workshops. Depending on the class students are asked to bring in 8 to 10 photos

with a theme sometimes an album and a few supplies. Decorate scissors and rulers paper punches and templates are available to use at the class. Other supplies can be purchased.

Everybody feeds off each other," said Buckhaves. It is good to set aside a good amount of time once you get rolling because you don't want to stop in the middle of everything."

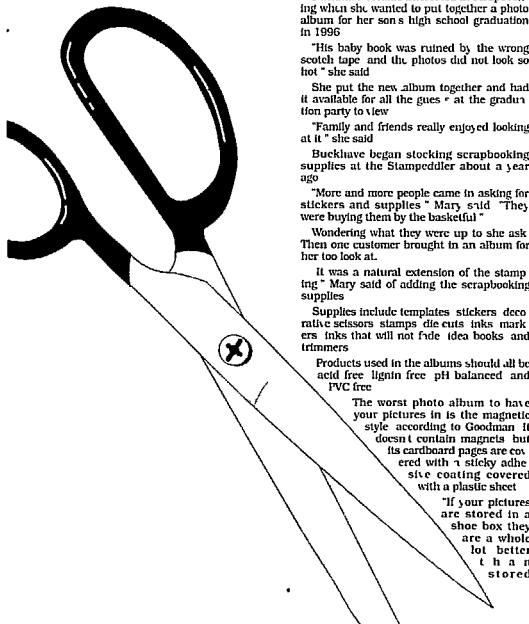
Creative Memories also has a getaway scrapbooking weekend planned.

Stampeddler will be moving out of its Mary Alexander Court store to its new location at the corner of Main and Dunlap in a month or two where the scrapbooking department

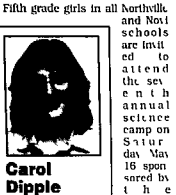
will be expanded. "It is a craze there is no doubt about it. It is really incredible," said Buckhaves.

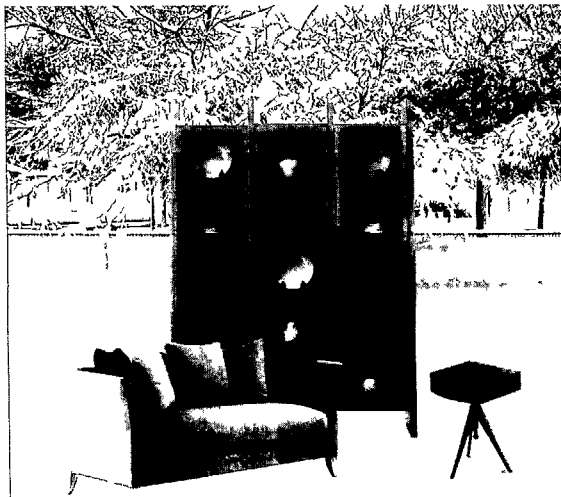

## 'Grease'

Classic rock 'n' roll film marks 20th anniversary

"Grease" is still the word and fans both young and old will get a chance to experience it on the big screen once again. The cult film will be re-released for a 20th anniversary celebration beginning March 27.

"Grease" has racked up nearly 2,200 performances on Broadway, becoming the longest-running hit currently on the boards and passing "Oklahoma!" to become the eighth-longest running production in Broadway history.

The idea to write a musical tribute to a by-gone era was conceived in 1971 by writers Jim Jacobs and Warren Casey.

The musical was tried out in a small experimental theater in Chicago. A group of producers from New York caught the act and made an on-the-spot deal to adapt the production for the New York stage. On Valentine's Day, 1972, the Fifties came to life on stage at off-Broadway's Eden Theatre, and on June 27, 1977, the Fifties came to film when the Robert Stigwood/Allan Carr production of "Grease" started shooting for Paramount Pictures.

The show has gone on to become an American classic as well as an international smash—with versions turning up

in Mexico, Europe, and Australia and with national companies attracting "Grease" fanatics wherever they go.

"Grease" inspired a Fifties craze which has gone on to produce such major successes as "American Graffiti" and television's top-rated "Happy Days" series.

"Grease" coincidentally returned to the Pantages Theatre in L.A. while the film was shooting.

The show's popularity would seem to be never-ending.

While fascination with the recent past has now become an American cultural staple, "Grease" is not just a nostalgic look at a simpler decade; it is peopled with characters of universal appeal—lovable, pop art renditions of identifiable kids. It's an energetic and exciting musical homage to the age of rock 'n' roll, and the music captures audiences much the same way Elvis Presley's tunes did. "Grease" also happens to be rather perceptive on issues of pride and self-image, but its major appeal is that it's fun.

To make "Grease" shine, producers Robert Stigwood and Allan Carr assembled a cast and crew to rival that of all other musical productions in film history. John Travolta, America's number one

heartthrob as Vinnie Barbarino on the top-rated "Welcome Back Kotter" series, was everyone's first choice to play the role of Danny Zuko on the screen.

Fresh from filming "Saturday Night Fever" (for which he received extraordinary acclaim and awards, including an Academy Award nomination as Best Actor) for Stigwood, Travolta boasted just the right mixture of animal magnetism

and innocence.

To complement Travolta's charms, Stigwood and Carr persuaded international recording star Olivia Newton-John to make her American film debut. Olivia stars as Sandy, Travolta's beautifully and painfully innocent love interest.

Stockard Channing, acclaimed on Broadway in "Two Gentlemen from Verona" and on film in "The

Fortune," rounds out the starring roles as Rizzo, a tough talking, very liberated "Pink Lady."

Making special guest appearances in the film is an impressive group of stars reminiscent of the Fifties. Eve Arden plays Rydell High School's Principal McGee. Frankie Avalon is Teen Angel. Joan Blondell is Vi, everyone's heart-of-gold, fast talking confidante/waitress. Edd Byrnes

appears as Vince Fontaine, the slick host of National Bandstand; Sid Caesar is Coach Calhoun; and Sha-Na-Na is everyone's favorite flits group, Johnny Casino and the Gamblers.

"Grease" promises to once again be a return to musical movie-making of a more innocent era, offering film audiences a valentine to the Fifties and a rama-lama-ding-dong time.

## Popular film returns to Oscars

Yet it's still pretty clear, the United States is back on the map and ready to take in a whole new col-

lection of honors.

There are some other refreshing changes that will add to the mix of this year's Oscar's presentation—young actors, actresses and writers making their mark and giving those more seasoned

nominees—Anthony Hopkins, Robert Duvall, Peter Fonda, Dustin Hoffman, Robin Williams, Jack Nicholson and the like—a run for their money.

"Good Will Hunting" best actor nominee Matt Damon, 27, and his best friend Ben Affleck, 25, who co wrote the film are both going to be recognized. Damon's "Hunting" costar, Minnie Driver, has been nominated for best supporting actress.

Best actress nominee Kate Winslet, 22, who enchanted audiences in this year's blockbuster "Titanic" is the youngest actress to ever be nominated for two Academy Awards. Her famous co-star Leonardo DiCaprio, 23 was not nominated for any individual awards, but no doubt contributed to the film's best picture nomination.

This generational mix is guaranteed to make for an interesting and exciting Oscar presentation as we wait to see who takes it—youth or experience.

Now the only thing left to do is keep our fingers crossed in hopes that 1998 will be an even better year for great American films, and an even more exciting Oscar presentation next year.

## Simply, the best!

Humble beginnings grow into a state championship for the Northville/Novi gymnastics team

It's been four years in the making, but Northville/Novi's dream of winning a state gymnastics championship finally came true last Friday at Rockford High School when the Mustangs crushed the 12-team field with a school-record 146.2 points.

The team trailed Portage by .15 points after two events, but used its best beam performance of the season to surge past the Huskies and claim its first-ever state title in just its fourth year of existence.

"I have never seen my girls all on at one time," coach Laura Moyers said of her teams' 36.7 score on the beam. "No one expected the girls to do that, especially at a pressure time like that."

"I knew every team had a couple girls fall. You kind of expect that as a coach."

None of the Mustangs fell as it turned a slight deficit into a 109.20-107.45 lead after three events. Northville/Novi cruised through the floor exercise to make

the state championship official.

"It was the best feeling in the world," senior Stacey Williamson said. "Last year we thought we had a good chance to win it, but in gymnastics you never know."

"It was great," senior Missy MacRae said. "As soon as we knew

we had won the championship we began hugging each other and crying. Last year we weren't as confident going in, but this year we knew what we had to do and we pushed ourselves to win."

Portage came back to finish second with 143.85 points. Rochester was third with 142.75 points followed by Rochester

Adams (142.7), four-time defending champion Holland (142.6), Hartland (141.8), Troy-Athens (140.75), Freeland (139.9), Brighton (139.65), Grand Rapids Forest Hills (137.9), Hillsdale (134.5) and Plymouth Canton (133.8).

Moyers decision to go with Gina Spinazze and Danean Pazdan to start the beam competition paid off. Spinazze scored a 9.15 and Pazdan an 8.7 to get the team going.

"Gina has been consistent on the beam all year and I think if you get one person with a solid performance you get a snowball going," the coach said. "Danean followed up with a great performance and it just went on from there."

"I'm pretty comfortable getting it over with," Spinazze said. "I usually suck it, but connecting is sometimes a problem."

Krsten Levin followed up with a 9.0 and MacRae and Williamson rounded out the routine with scores of 9.3 and 9.25.

"I was the last one to go and Laura told me just to go out there and have fun," Williamson said. "I knew we had four good scores already, so I just went out there and performed. When I was done, I knew I had a good score."

Northville/Novi's floor performance was nothing short of spectacular. Erica Winn and Nicole Pelletier started things off with a 9.05 and 8.95. Levin went third and scored a 9.05 and MacRae posted an impressive 9.4. To top it off, Spinazze led the win with a team high 9.5 to end the days festivities.

Moyers' father and assistant athletic director at Rockford, Harvey DeGood, presented his daughter and her team with the championship trophy.

"That was a special little touch," she said. "It kind of brought tears to my eyes."

Northville/Novi had a solid start, scoring a 36.25 on the vault and bars competitions. MacRae and Jennifer Rohlfis led the way on bars with a 9.35. Spinazze had an 8.85 and Williamson and Winn rounded the team out with an 8.7 and 8.55.

Three Mustangs topped nine on the vault. Winn scored a 9.15, Pelletier a 9.1 and Rohlfis a 9.05. MacRae finished with an 8.95 and Williamson an 8.65.

Moyers said Northville/Novi's past experiences played a key role in the championship.

"Most of them have been there two, three or four times so they knew what it's like," she said. "They didn't get so nervous and with it being their last meet, I knew they wanted to go out on top."

The team will lose eight seniors.

### ROHLFIS, SPINAZZE WIN INDIVIDUAL TITLES

Spinazze came back Saturday and won an individual championship on the floor and Rohlfis took home a vault title and the all-around crown in Division II.

The three championships were the first individual titles ever for a Northville/Novi gymnast.

Rohlfis scored a 9.2 to take the vault title and a 36.05 to tie Michelle Travis of Holland for the all-around championship. The sophomore also placed fourth on the bars with a 9.15.

Spinazze scored a 9.3 on the floor to take the Division II title and also finished tied for sixth with an 8.8 on the bars.

In Division I, MacRae and Williamson just missed placing in the top 10. The two seniors finished tied for 11th with scores of 35.75. The 10th-place finisher ended up with a 37.75.

"The Division I competition was as good as I've ever seen it," said Moyers.

MacRae finished fifth on the floor (9.4) and Williamson was ninth with a 9.25.

MacRae was the lone Mustang to place on the bars with an eighth-place finish at 9.1. Williamson was the lone placer on the beam for Northville/Novi (8th, 9.25).

"Jennifer pulled it all together on Saturday," said Moyers. "She's struggled all year on the balance beam but she really proved herself."

## Torrence dominates field, wins state title

It couldn't have ended any other way for Northville senior Rickey Torrence.

And it didn't.

Torrence won the state championship at 119 pounds Saturday at the state wrestling tournament at the Kellogg Center in Battle Creek.

The captain capped off an undefeated senior campaign that saw him accumulate 25 falls, 194 team points and 111 takedowns. But more impressively, he had only two takedowns against him and one reversal, the entire season.

Torrence pinned Sterling Heights' Monte Lewis in the finals at 3:08 to win the school's second individual wrestling championship in as many years. Nick Sriramin won the title at 112 pounds last year.

Torrence lost to Lewis at last year's state meet, but would not be denied this year. He breezed through the tournament beginning with an opening round pin of Midland Dow's Tony Smith at 4:59. From there he crushed Brighton's Leif Olson 10-0 and David Martinelli of Roseville 15-3 in the semifinals.

"He (Lewis) and I knew we would be in the finals since we wrestled with each other last summer," Torrence said. "I've been planning out this match out in my head for over a year now. In class, in practice, at meets, everywhere."

"He has been one of the most outstanding wrestlers Northville has ever seen," coach Bob Townsend said. "He has always been a great leader, always think-

ing of the team first. It's just great to see a kid that works that hard to achieve a goal finally win it."

Torrence said it has long been his goal to win the championship.

"My unwritten goal was to be an undefeated state champion," he said.

Fellow senior Bryan Grider capped off a great career as well with a fifth-place finish at 215. Grider took the long road, wrestling five matches before beating Troy Banton of Traverse City Western 17-9 in the fifth-place match.

Unfortunately for Grider, he ran into Portage Central's Jim Kilcoyne twice, and was pinned both times. He beat Shane Gray of Royal Oak Kimball 8-7, won by default over Allen Clark of New Baltimore Anchor Bay and pinned Randy Logan of Port Huron to get to the second meeting with Kilcoyne.

"He really stepped it up at this tournament," Townsend said. "This kid is so strong and he wrestled at 215 even though he was only 189 pounds. In our four years coaching, he's probably bailed us out the most with pins when we needed them."

Fellow captain Anant Saran won his first two matches relatively easy, but then stumbled a bit.

The junior beat Ryan Tobin of Grand Rapids Union 12-2 and Jon Nagy of Romeo 10-3. Then he lost to Milford's Jason Amell 8-7 and Greg Stauffer of Saline 10-6 and fell down to a fifth place

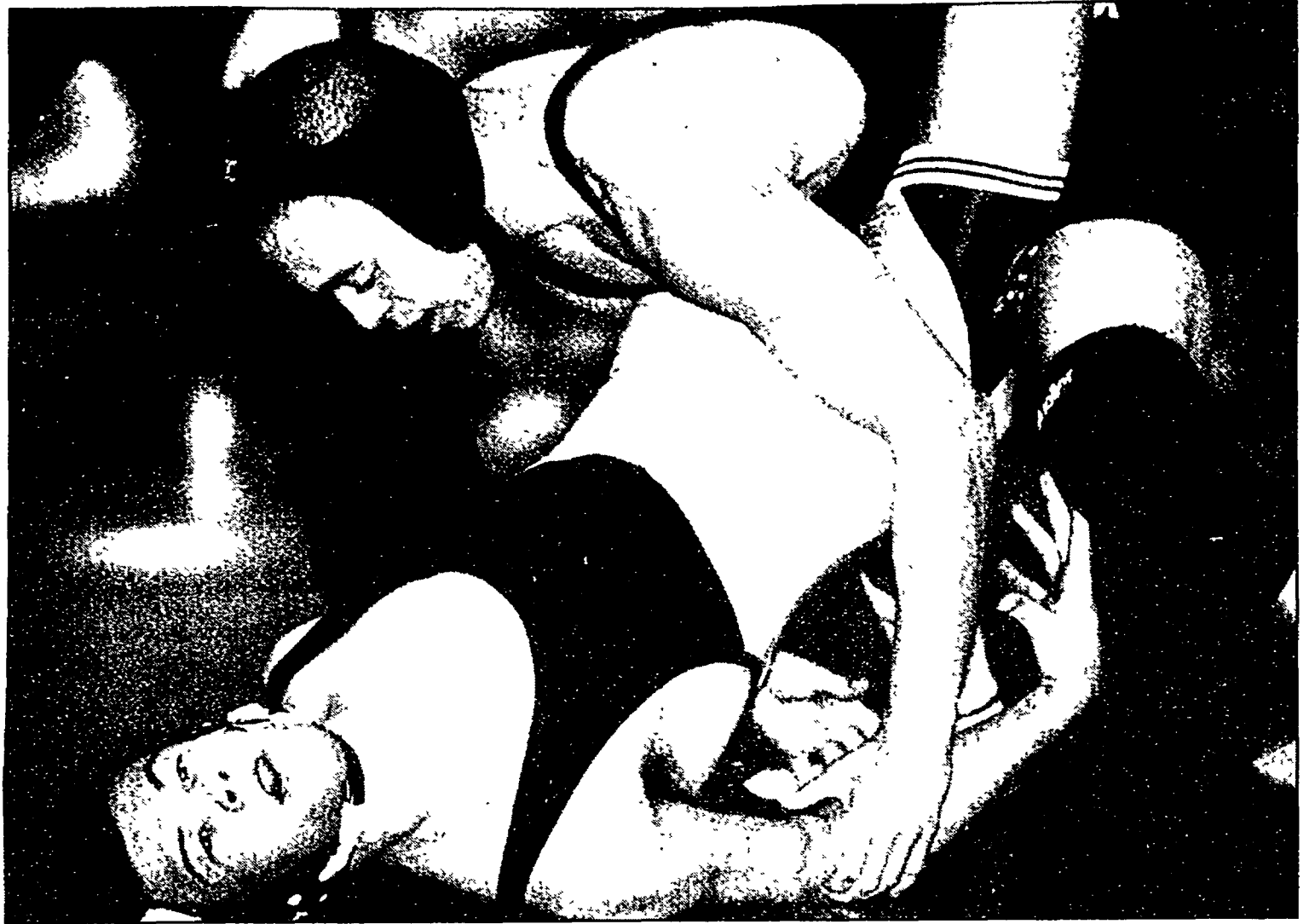

match against Pat Wheeler of Roseville. He won by default and became the highest-placing junior in Northville history with his fifth-place finish.

"He wrestled smooth in his first two matches, but he just didn't look into it the next two," the coach said. "This is the most intense guy on the team and he'll be back next year. He'll be a tear next year."

Reggie Torrence and Ted Bowersox made it five Northville wrestlers to place when they both finished seventh in their divisions.

Torrence wrestled in the same class as Saran, but finished two spots behind after beating Rochester Adams' Pat Diaz 5-3 in

overtime. He opened the day with a 15-3 win over Nico Lopez of Kalamazoo Central before falling to Wheeler of Roseville 5-1 in the second round.

The sophomore bounced back to beat Aaron Herd of Swartz Creek 5-3 before falling to Stauffer 7-4.

"Reggie had a great sophomore season. To step up like he did as an individual was incredible," Townsend said. "The potential is there to win a couple state championships."

Bowersox competed in a young but talented heavyweight bracket. He lost his first match to James Nelson of Port Huron Northern by fall at 5:30 but bounced back quickly. The junior top of James

Pack of Rochester Adams 11-5 and Bill McCloud of Utica Ford 2-1.

He then lost to Adam Oswald of Bay City Central before finishing the day with a 5-4 win over Nate Avdek of Muskegon Reeths-Puffer.

"The only thing Ted lacks is confidence, and when he is confident he's tough to beat. He's such a big, strong kid and he's been a great leader for us," the coach said.

Matt Tarrow (103) and Dan Scappaticci (140) did not place, but wrestled tough in their respective divisions.

Tarrow topped Andy Coleman of Grand Rapids Forest Hills Central 7-3 in his first match, but fell to Scott Ditchie of Fraser and Dan Hornrich of Grandville to end his

season.

Scappaticci, wrestling in the toughest weight class at the tournament, was pinned by defending state champion Craig Parker of East Kentwood and Joe Streeter of Davison in his first two matches.

"Just to make it here is a big accomplishment, and I think these guys have laid the foundation for a great team next year," Townsend said.

Rickey Torrence, Grider, Mike Livanos and Jason Dowdell are starters that are graduating, leaving some holes for Townsend and coach Garnett Potter.

"Watch out next year, we are going to be up there all year long," Townsend said.

# Upset time at districts

What a difference six weeks and four healthy players can make.

The Northville boys' basketball team turned the tables on Plymouth Salem, using a 13-2 run midway through the fourth quarter to come from 10 points down and turn away the Rocks in the district championship game at Novi High School Friday night.

The district title was the schools' first since coach Tim Lutes' team won it back in 1981-82. Northville played Detroit Central last night (after the Records' deadline) in the regional semifinals.

Senior guard Dave Terakedis and junior forward Marshall Knapp scored 25 points in a fourth quarter that saw the Mustangs outscore the Rocks 30-15. Terakedis scored 19 of his season-high 39 points in the quarter.

"He came through huge for us," coach Scott Baldwin said. "He took it by the throat and refused to lose it."

Terakedis averaged 17 points a game as a junior, but has been the focus of Mustang opponents this season. Coming into the game the captain was averaging just under 15 points a game this season.

"(Kelly) Bingley did a good job penetrating and

getting me the ball," Terakedis said. "We really didn't do anything different, it was just clicking for us. Everything we did seemed to work."

Trailing by 10 points with 5:46 to play, the Mustangs went on a 13-2 run to take a one-point lead with just under two minutes remaining.

"I told the kids during the timeout that if we wanted to make a run, we had to do it now," Baldwin said. "So they responded by causing four straight turnovers."

Knapp, Terakedis and Bingley scored 12 of the team's points during the run, a run similar to the one the Rocks used against Northville in a 63-45 win January 27.

"I think the difference was that we were healthy and they were a little less healthy," Terakedis said. "We also had great coaching and everyone stepped it up." Northville was missing four players the first time the two teams met.

"We didn't do anything different," Baldwin said. "But I really think he's (Terakedis) been dreaming about this game his entire life."

"He has the biggest heart of any kid I've ever coached. He really wanted that game and everyone rallied around him."

Terakedis hit 12 of 13 free throws in the fourth quarter and 17 of 20 for the game. He also connected on six of nine three-point attempts.

Knapp finished with 13 points and six rebounds and Rob Reel had eight boards and five assists.

Detroit Central finished second in the Detroit Public School league and features 6-foot-5 forward Antonio Gates. Gates is in the running for Michigan's Mr. Basketball and has signed a letter-of-intent to play football at Michigan State next year.

### N'VILLE 63, CHURCHILL 61

The Stangs led this game from start to finish. Up 33-28 at halftime, Northville extended its lead to 48-40 after three quarters. Churchill hit a pair of meaningless baskets in the last seconds to make the score close.

"We simply outplayed them," the coach said. "Knapp single-handedly took over this game in the second half."

Knapp scored 12 of his 14 points in the second half to help his team advance to the district championship game.

Terakedis led the way with 16 points and Bingley added 14.

# Picard china known for excellent design

Q. Enclosed is a picture of a small porcelain pitcher that I have. It stands 5 inches high and is in perfect condition. Marked on the bottom are the words "Limoges - France - Hand Painted China - W.A. Pickard."

Could you tell me what it is worth and if it is an antique?

A. Wilder A. Picard of Chicago imported porcelain blanks from Europe. He employed some of the most talented china decorators available, many of whom were immigrants who had served their apprenticeships in European potteries and china factories. Picard's studio became one of the first commercial studios to produce fine hand-painted china in large quantities for the giftware market.

In recent years the firm has received commissions to produce china for American presidents, the Queen of England and U.S. embassies worldwide.

The pattern is Pink Mums and was made between 1903 and 1905. Decorators Vobornuk and Klippahn are both known to have painted the chrysanthemums pattern.

Your pitcher is an antique and would probably be worth about \$225 to \$275.

Q. I have inherited a set of Stangl Pottery Birds from my aunt. She told me they are valu-

able. One is a cardinal standing on a pine cone base. Another is a yellow bird that is perched facing down on a base. Each is numbered and has the enclosed mark on the bottom.

Please tell me what they are worth.

A. Stangl Pottery, Trenton and Flemington, N.J., introduced a line of pottery birds in 1910. Audubon prints were the inspiration for many of the birds.

Designer Auguste Jacob created and designed the models for molds, and then decorators applied the glazes. As a rule, each decorator signed his initials.

The "F" shows the piece was made at the Flemington factory. Your birds are circa 1940. The Yellow Prothonotary Warbler would probably be worth about \$135 and the cardinal about \$85.

Q. I have an Arts and Crafts style brass desk set. It consists of a blotter, matching inkwell, a stamp box, a letter holder, spiked receipt holder and a brass letter opener. All pieces are decorated with a stylized butterfly motif.

## ANTIQUES

Your *fin de siecle* desk set would probably be worth \$200 to \$300.
