## City council proposes hike to water rates

■ Residents can expect an increase of about 8.7 percent according to administration proposal

Northville residents will have a chance to say their peace about a proposed 8.7 percent increase to water and sewer service at a Dec. 7 public hearing.

The Northville city council set the hearing after city manager Gary Word and finance director Nickle Bateson made the recommendation to change the utility rates Monday evening.

Based on a proposal outlined by Bateson, the city would bump up the per-unit price of water from \$2.10 to \$3.82. Sewer service would drop from its current \$4.75 unit price to \$3.62. Overall, it's an increase of 59 cents per unit.

The current rates have held steady since June of 1997.

One unit is equal to 1,000 gallons.

Bateson said a number of factors were taken into consideration before the rate increase was proposed:

- Plante & Moran, the city's auditors, encouraged maintaining a minimum of \$500,000 to \$700,000 in working capital for the water and sewer fund to provide for cash flow and emergency expenditures;

- The five-year plan for capital improvements to the water and sewer system have budgeted \$1.5 million in spending through the summer of 2005, and;

- Increases of 6.43 percent for water and 5.3 percent for sewer were imposed by the city of Detroit and Wayne County, respectively, that in turn are passed along to the city of Northville.

"It's our goal to keep the rates as consistent as possible," Bateson said, adding that the city wanted to make the focus of its water-related spending on capital improvements and not on debt payments.

Public works director Jim Gallogly pointed out that at certain times during heavy precipitation, the city dumps in more water for sanitary sewer treatment than it pays for because of infiltration at certain points along the city's sewer lines.

"It's not the regular discharge

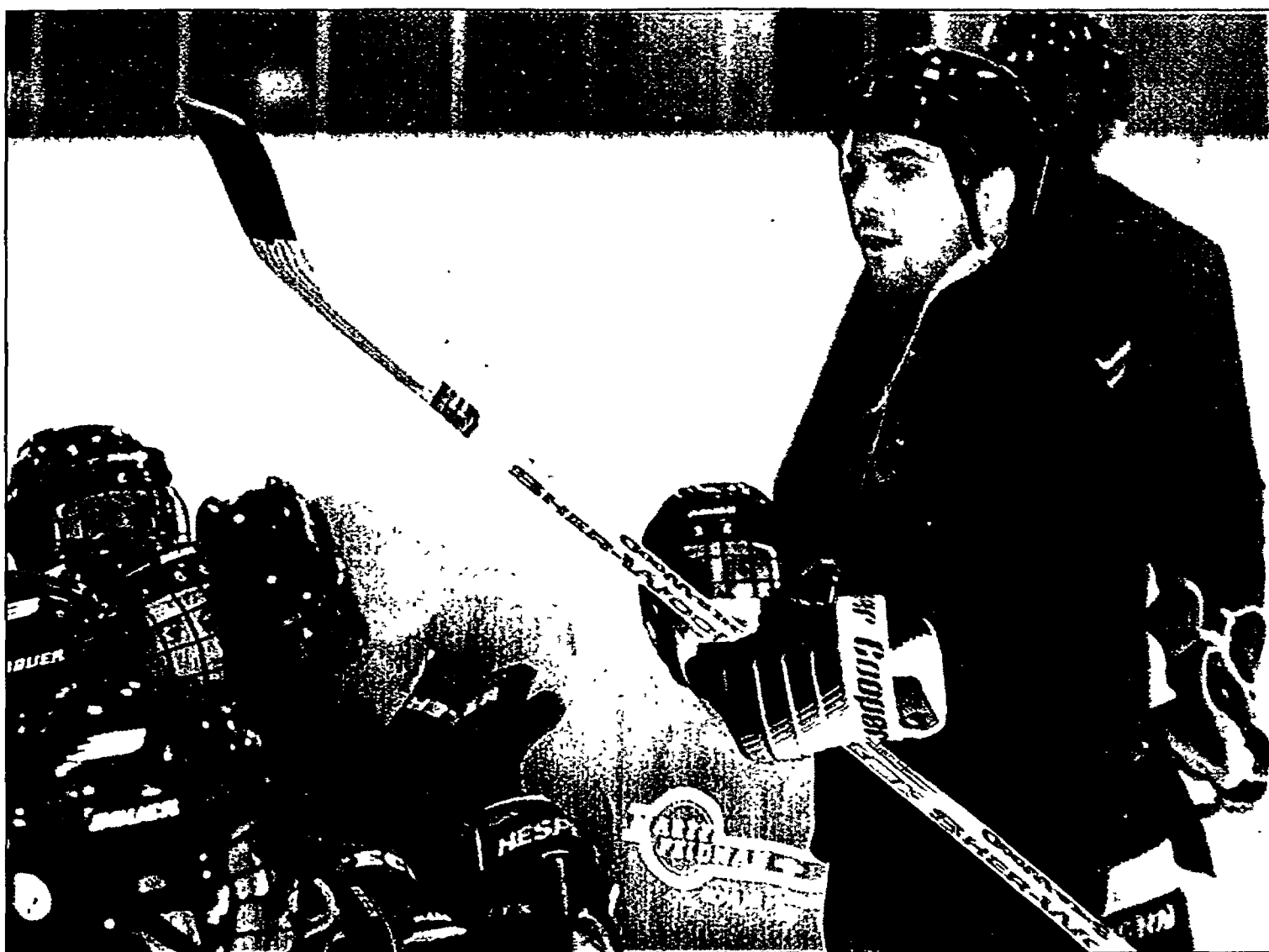

## It's time to... SWING

Dance craze sweeps through Northville

Triple step, triple step, rock step.

Break it down to basics and you've got a simple dance move any couple can master.

Embellish it with sweetheart wraps, low kicks and partner spins and you've got an upbeat, impressive set of moves that make up the latest dance craze.

Swing dancing is sweeping the nation, and the trend landed in Northville in September with beginner classes at the Northville Community Recreation Center.

Dance instructor Elaine Kallio said she suspects swing has gained popularity due to movies like "Swing Kids" and "Swingers" and a Gap commercial with khaki clad twenty-somethings performing acrobatic swing.

"Things take a while to trickle into Detroit," Kallio said. "Swing is replacing country as the newest hottest dance."

Big band revival bands are hit-

ting the top of the charts and bars are hiring swing dance instructors to spread the trend, but for people who'd rather get the basics in an alcohol- and smoke-free environment, studio classes may be the best option.

The rec center has offered country line dance lessons for years but program director Pat Brown was inspired to start a swing class by her daughter

Ellen, 16.

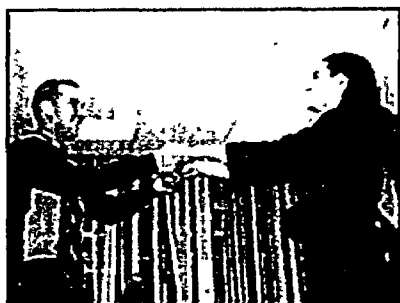
"My daughter's in high school and she came home and said 'Mom I want to take swing. It's really in,'" Brown said. "It's having a resurgence."

Fifty-five people signed up for the fall classes, and Brown had to close enrollment and start a waiting list.

Those that got in learned the basic swing step on the first day, and added an average of two moves to their repertoire every Wednesday evening.

"It's very, very popular," Brown said.

Swing began in the 1930s with

the music of Count Basie and Glen Miller. Now, bands like the Brian Setzer Orchestra and Cherry Poppin' Daddies, or more locally, the Starlight Drifters, add a modern twist to the old swing style.

The latest swing dancing is based on the Jitterbug and the Lindy Hop, variations that were considered vulgar when they first evolved.

"Swing gives you a ton of freedom compared to a lot of other

dances," Kallio said. "Most ballroom dancing is very structured. You stand a certain way, you hold your head a certain way. Swing lets you bring in your own styling and your own personality a lot more than the other dances do."

Depending on your age it can be very athletic, too. But if you don't dare dips and aials it's fit for any age.

## Defamation suit filed against Zaas by school principal

Although a lawsuit against Amerman Elementary School principal Stephen Anderson was dropped last month, allegations made against him linger on.

According to Anderson, those remarks damaged his reputation in the community he serves.

After Robin Zaas failed to retract statements that appeared in print and broadcast media, Anderson filed a countersuit for defamation of character last March.

The suit will go to jury trial in 6th Circuit U. S. District Court in Ann Arbor Feb. 16.

Judge George Steeh, who dismissed the original lawsuit against the district Nov. 9, will preside over the case.

"I think the counterclaim is very strong," said Anderson's attorney Terry Miglio, of the Detroit firm Keller, Thoma, Schwarze. "Especially given the fact that certain

Zaas family members pursued media attention and used the media to publicize the damaging accusations against Dr. Anderson who was doing nothing more than his job as an administrator to the school district."

Zaas appeared on local television news and made allegations against Anderson in publications including *The Detroit News* and *The Northville Record*.

In a *Detroit News* article published August 28, 1997, for example, she said Anderson "physically attacked" her.

She also said that nothing was done to prevent her daughter Stephanie, then 8, from being bullied by two classmates.

"They harassed me because I complained," Zaas told *The Detroit News*.

After the article appeared, Anderson demanded a retraction

# Northville veteran shares memories of World War I

At age 102, Bill Klope doesn't get around quite the same as he did 80 years ago. Of course, 82 years ago, Klope was drifting over the icy waters of the North Atlantic Ocean amid a fleet of hidden German U-boats.

Klope is one of the Northville's few living veterans of World War I. A crew member of the U.S.S. Kansas, Klope's hands quake a bit and he'll ask you to speak up if you're talking to him. But his mind is right on, making his memories of the War to End All Wars as vivid as a painter's palette.

Klope's involvement in World War I came on his own terms when he enlisted. His family and friends told him his decision was a dangerous one, as the German U-boat attacks were at their peak.

It was 1917.

There were hungry nights, cold

days and a calendar which seemed to move along at a snail's pace for the Tennessee native, but Klope survived. And along the way, he had a few recollections which still put a smile on his face.

## C-C-C-COLD!

The North Atlantic Ocean wasn't the easiest place to be in the winter of 1917-1918, Klope said. As a helmsman, Klope often found himself at the bow of the ship, footsteps away from the churning waters of an icy, salty sea. As a precautionary measure, helmsmen were secured to the ships wearing harnesses and ropes.

Of course, before he could be strapped into the ship, he needed to get dressed for the elements. That meant donning a wool jacket, wool pants and event wool underwear.

"It wasn't too comfortable — I can tell you that," Klope said.

But even the thickest of clothing wasn't enough to protect Klope or anyone else from the crashing waves of the sea which cascaded over the deck of the ship. Klope said rocky seas and a cold spray made for a wicked combination.

"You'd finish your shift and just come out as one giant block of ice," Klope said. "You'd need help from people to get out of your clothes because your body was too stiff to move."

## THE POSTAGE STAMP

With peace secured and the war over, Klope returned to the United States. His ship docked near Atlanta, Ga., where he and his shipmates were allowed to get reacquainted with life on land.

It wasn't the easiest transition, though. While at sea, Klope, like all servicemen, were allowed to send mail free of charge back home. Now that they were on shore, postage was their problem.

The other problem Klope confronted was having no cash.

"I didn't have one nickel to my name," Klope recalled. "The records for payroll had been lost somewhere along the way, and they were a good two or three months behind on getting any of us our money."

With no friends or relatives in the Atlanta area, Klope's homecoming wasn't exactly starting off

the way he'd hoped. While strolling the city streets, Klope came across a non-cancelled postage stamp. He walked down to a store, where a clerk gave him a sheet of paper and a pencil.

With those tools in hand, Klope drafted a letter to his mother, telling him that he needed money.

The money arrived, but when Klope finally returned home to Tennessee, Klope gave the \$20 bill back to his mom. He'd managed to get by without her help.

without its heartache. Klope's brother, who waited to be drafted into military service, was killed.

Having had the opportunity to reflect on the war's meaning, Klope said World War I was an epic no one, save for a tiny group of national leaders, wanted to participate in.

"America didn't want it. The Europeans — they didn't want it," Klope said. "This was all about Kaiser Wilhelm and what he wanted to do."

Klope said he never returned to Europe after the war ended, and has no plans to do so. The French government made a strong push this year to locate as many veterans of the war back to the site of the conflict to be honored. Officials at the French embassy said the country felt it necessary to continue to express gratitude to those who fought for France's freedom.

Historians eventually dubbed World War I "The War to End All Wars." Twenty years later, when the German army was growing in strength once again, Klope realized that title wasn't going to last.

Klope's son died in the second European affair.

"When I was younger, I sort of viewed the first World War as an opportunity for adventure," Klope said. "World War II was a tragedy."

He paused. "War is a terrible, terrible thing," he said.

# Detroit Economic Club hosts Northville students

The Detroit Economic Club is an exclusive forum that promotes discussion of economic, political and social ideas.

A group of Northville High School students recently got to hear one of those talks when they were treated to a student conference and luncheon with former congressman Jack Kemp on Nov. 9.

Jim Nield, Northville resident and retired president of Diamond Systems, sponsored the student conference.

"I think it's important for students to get exposure to a non-academic experience outside the classroom," Nield said. "It's good to meet a person who's really given of himself to others, which Jack Kemp has."

The Republican candidate for Vice President in August of 1996, Kemp's long career in politics followed 13 years as a professional football quarterback for the San Diego Chargers and the Buffalo Bills.

From 1971 to 1989, Kemp represented the Buffalo area and western New York in the United States House of Representatives, for seven years serving as Chairman of the House Republican

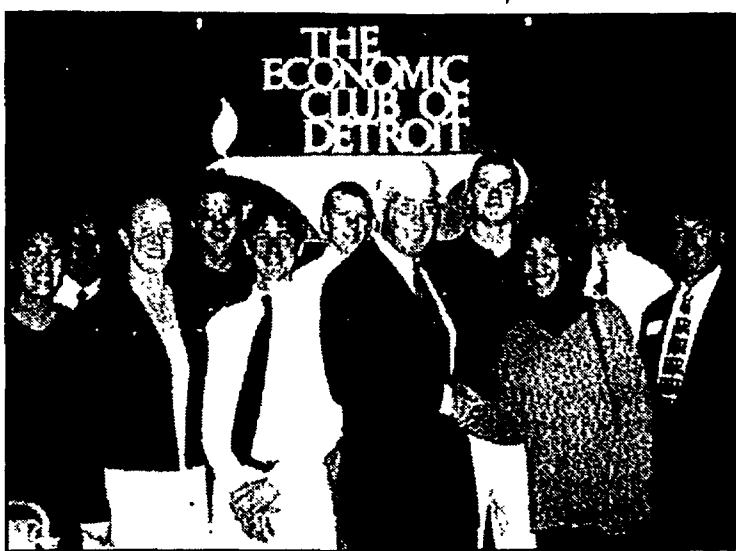

He also served for four years as Secretary of Housing and Urban Development.

Northville is now a co-director of

Empower America, a public policy and advocacy organization he co-founded in 1993 with William Bennett and Ambassador Jeane Kirkpatrick.

At the conference, Kemp fielded questions from visiting students from Northville, St. Mary's High School, Farmington Harrison High School, and Walsh College.

In answering their queries, Kemp promoted Habitat for Humanity, an organization that builds homes for the needy.

"When you own something and call it your own, you not only take a longer perspective, but gain collateral that you can turn into education, retirement, credit," Kemp said. "We need to give everyone a stake in America."

He also said the Republican party needs to better meet the needs of people in the inner cities, and called for the privatization of Social Security.

"I think we ought to say working men and women should have personal retirement accounts," Kemp said, citing statistics that 15.3 percent of wages are taken for social security, with a return rate of less than 1 percent, while a personal mutual fund has a return rate of 8 to 9 percent.

"Every man and woman in America would be a millionaire by the time they were 65. Why aren't we doing it?" Kemp said.

He also proposed getting rid of

the capital gains tax for people who make less than 200 percent of the poverty level.

"We need to create income and make the rewards for working higher than the rewards for not working," Kemp said.

After the student conference, students lined up with Economic Club members to shake Kemp's hand and get autographs from both Kemp and Bill Lambier, who was present for the speech.

Students also met Don Barden, who is on the club's board of directors.

Then, they sat down for a lunch of chicken, wild rice and green beans with carrot cake for dessert before listening to Kemp's speech and then posing for pictures with the politician.

"It's a wonderful opportunity to be able to come into contact with a speaker with the magnitude of Jack Kemp and to meet some of Detroit's business leaders," said senior class advisor and social studies teacher Chris Ford. "It personalizes politics for kids."

The nine students were chosen for the field trip from among Northville High's student government and activity leaders.

They included Christina Chase,

senior class president, Matt Hare, junior class president, Mindy Marburger, junior class secretary, Tim Edick, varsity basketball and baseball player and a former volunteer for Joe Knollenberg's campaign, Jenny Guerin, Kelsey Jenney, Mat Spisak and Tom Stimmell.

They were chaperoned by Nield, Ford, and Kurt Kinde, an English and drama instructor.

Nield has agreed to sponsor one more trip to the Economic Club this school year, and has offered the list of visiting speakers for Johnson to choose from.

The second venture has not yet been planned.

Nield, husband of school board trustee Martha Nield, said that in retirement he hopes to do good deeds for the community, and helping students is part of that.

"We get so academically motivated. We, as parents, want students to do so well in school, but it's just as important that they do well in life. I hope small experiences like this get them motivated in ways apart from just the next test," Nield said. "I hope there's a point in everyone's life to give back."

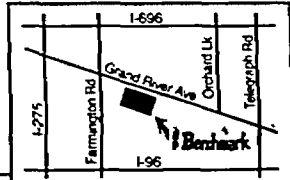

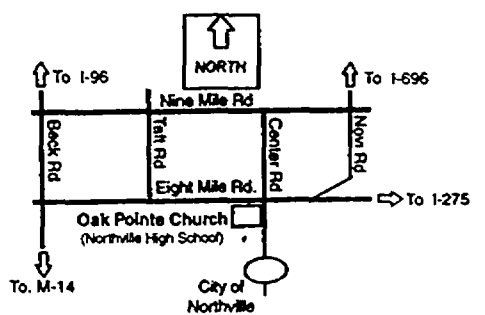

Soon, they'll begin work on a smoothie bar, install new carpet, and repaint the walls.

The improvements to the historic building at Griswold and Main streets will total almost \$300,000 and are expected to be finished the first week of December.

Owner Chris Klebba said the minor inconveniences will be well worth the wait.

"When you walk into the club, your first response will be 'wow!'" Klebba said. "But in a personal, comfortable environment. We are not trying to be the biggest and flashiest club. We want to keep a personal approach, just make it more unique and a little more fun."

After the "cardio deck" is completed, the current cardiovascular equipment will be moved upstairs and about 15 more pieces will be added, including Reebok and Precor elliptical trainers.

A 10-television entertainment system with 10 stations and six private music choices will be wired upstairs, and Klebba said patrons will be able to bring in their own

CD's or cassettes.

"Thirty minutes on a treadmill is boring. Hopefully that will spice things up," Klebba said.

With more room freed up on the ground floor, Klebba plans to add several new pieces of strength training equipment and a 15-seat counter with a TV nearby for Superbowl parties.

"It'll be a nice gathering point to have a shake or smoothie or to hang out a little bit," Klebba said.

The improvements are all part of "Phase 2" of Chris and Ellen Klebba's original business plan, which was formulated when they opened the gym at 235 E. Main St. three years ago.

The renovations were meant to improve services to existing members, not attract more membership, he said.

"We think there are some essential ingredients missing from our

club and that's what this will bring to the table," Klebba said.

The color scheme and interior design will be revamped too, with new carpeting, paint and decor.

Locals have been hired to execute the facelift, including architect Greg Presley, designer Dennis Larson and artist Jeff Von-Buskirk.

"We're going for a warm, industrial look," Klebba said. "This is being built with a lot of trust and faith that it'll be a win-win situation for all of us."

On a recently renewed 15-year lease, Klebba said Water Wheel's roots run deep in the community.

Unlike larger gym chains, Water Wheel doesn't cater to hard core bodybuilders. Instead, the gym focuses on personalized service, and employees know each member by name.

That's what attracts members like Plymouth resident Marilyn Morgan, who joined last April while her daughter was training at All Star Gymnastics in the same building.

"It's a very friendly, people-oriented club," Morgan said.

She said she is looking forward to the construction.

"I think it'll be wonderful when it's done. Chris has tried to get a lot of the work done on off-days. I'm here five to six days a week and the construction has not been a problem," Morgan said.

Closed only one day during the

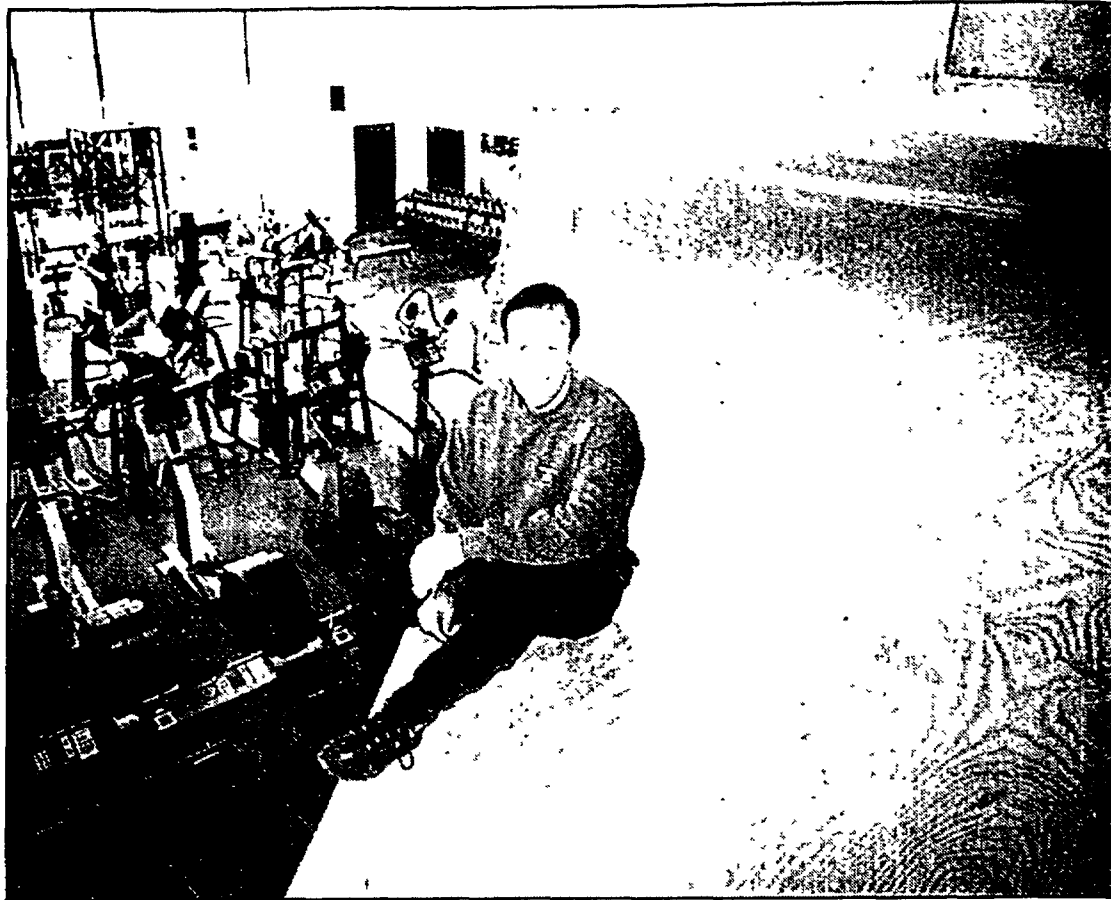

six-week construction, Klebba opted to keep the gym open after an informal poll of about 50 members.

"There were mixed emotions. Some didn't want to be here so they're not. We just wanted to give people the option," Klebba said.

Employees briefly evacuated the building Monday because the con-

struction dust was so thick. Still, a few patrons braved the conditions to work out.

Of Water Wheel's 500 members, Klebba estimated that about 250 work out regularly, or at least twice a week.

He thanked those who are temporarily putting up with lack of towels, noise and disarray in the

short term.

"We're really sorry for the inconvenience. Thanks for the patience. It will be worth it," Klebba said.

Membership at the Water Wheel Health Club is \$39 a month, with a \$95 registration fee. Contracts are one year long, and the fee is guaranteed for the life of the membership.

# Northville schools receive special education grant

Many students involved in the special education program at Northville Public Schools need not have ended up there.

Northville's director of special education Robert Sornson firmly believes that many learning disabilities begin as behavioral or developmental problems that can be corrected in the early years of a child's education.

Sornson recently secured a \$50,000 grant from Wayne County RESA to beef up the district's early intervention efforts and, in turn, shrink the special education population.

"The cost of special education is rising at a phenomenal rate. The idea is to invest money at early grade levels to save enormous amounts of money overall," Sornson said. "If we can intervene early and help children be successful in the early years, it's good for the student and the district. It's a no-brainer."

The 1998-99 Prevention Initiative Grant will establish an Instructional Support Team at one of the district's elementary schools.

The team will identify students with academic, social or behavioral problems and implement strategies to help them.

For the past two years, an Instructional Support Team at Silver Springs Elementary School has been a tremendous success.

Funded by federal Title I

grants, the team includes principal Ken Pawlowski, classroom teachers, instructional support teachers and learning consultants as well as parents, school

psychologists, reading specialists and speech therapists when necessary.

Since 1993, the number of students referred to special education at Silver Springs has dropped from 18 to five, while the entire special education program has shrunk from 35 students to ten.

Because of strategies implemented districtwide, the number of special education students in Northville Public Schools continues to drop, while national levels have more than doubled in the last ten years.

In an effort to increase the district's success, Sornson will use the grant to expand the Instructional Support Team model to another elementary school, to identify students at risk of learning failure and to prevent their decline.

"Most of these kids don't have to be unsuccessful in school," Sornson said.

Many children end up in special education programs after a series of failures that begin in the early grades, according to Sornson.

These failures can be caused by poorly developed language, attention or visual motor skills. They can also stem from behavioral characteristics.

If children enter Kindergarten

lacking in one of these areas, they may slip behind.

They won't become eligible for special education programs, however, until there is a discrepancy between IQ and achievement.

This discrepancy often doesn't show up until fourth grade, when Northville's curriculum becomes a demanding mix of chapter books, social studies, reading and math.

Sornson explained by that by the time students are referred to special ed, correcting learning problems is much more difficult because children have sunk into a pattern of frustration and poor self-image.

"If a kid identifies himself as a good reader or good at math, that's what he'll be. It's the power of self-concept and self-expectation. The opposite is also true," Sornson said. "After age nine, it's hard to change their basic concept that they are not good at reading or math. It makes sense. They've had a few bad years."

As a result, children are referred to special education programs that are costly for the district and squeeze money from other programs.

Students involved in special education leave their regular classrooms for individually tailored amounts of time. Some visit spe-

cial education teachers three hours each day, while others visit for half hour periods a few times a week.

This means more staff and smaller class sizes, costs the state doesn't fully fund.

The Prevention Initiative grant will fund the Instructional Support Team this year at a school yet to be chosen, and Sornson said there is a good chance the money will be renewed for the next two years.

If the program proves successful, it will be modeled by other schools in the district and perhaps by other districts.

The Instructional Support Team experience at Silver Springs has already been reported to a statewide prevention networking meeting held at the Michigan Department of Education in April and at a Statewide Prevention Conference at the Washtenaw Intermediate School District in October.

"We are trying to implement this as much as possible in every school," Sornson said. "This is proven to work."

Although the approach is focused on the lower performing ten percent of students, Sornson said students at all levels benefit from the team building, discipline and differentiated teaching that the program stresses.

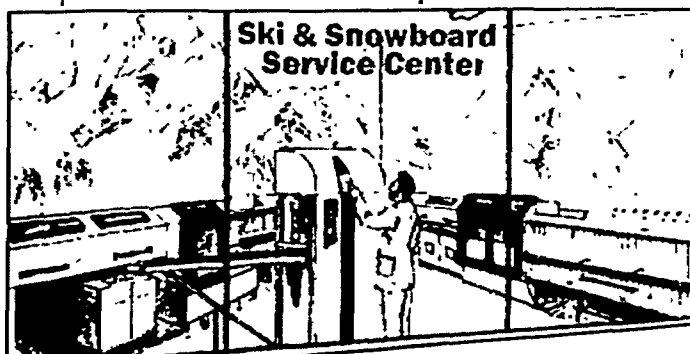

A computer check on the man's driver's license showed a strong possibility the man was wanted out of Alabama for two counts of sexual abuse, as the man's name, physical description and date of birth matched a wanted individual.

Police returned to the suspect's vehicle and informed the driver of the situation and asked permission to search his car, which the 44-year-old Westland man agreed to.

An open fanny pack was seen on the seat next to the man, which contained a baggy of marijuana. When asked about the drugs, the man said he'd forgotten they were there.

The man will be in court Dec. 10.

# Volunteers needed for park work

The block work complete, volunteer workers are now moving into the next phase of construction at Northville Community Park.

But Friends of Northville Parks & Recreation president Marv Gans said more supplies and volunteers are needed to finish the job.

"We're moving right along and doing really well," Gans said Thursday. "This is our biggest undertaking yet though, and we need some help."

The group is refurbishing the restrooms, concession areas, stor-

age facilities and installing lights at the Beck Road park. The cost of all the work is expected to top \$250,000, according to Gans.

While it's hoped that the park will be complete in time for a spring grand re-opening picnic and plaque dedication, a substantial amount of materials are still needed.

Gans said the group was seeking roof and shingle materials, ice and water block, roll-up doors, quarry tile, a tile setter and landscaping material.

The majority of the Friends' money is generated through its

once-a-year dinner auction, which netted nearly \$50,000 this past April. Gans stated a similar auction is slated for 1999.

The Friends have already raised thousands of dollars for other Northville and Northville Township park improvements. Gans said the group has used \$18,000 for resurfacing tennis courts and Fish Hatchery Park, added a \$10,000 aerator to Fish Hatchery Park, placed a roof over the maintenance building and purchased lawnmowers for Northville Community Park.

In addition, Gans stated \$71,000

in renovations have been made to Ford Field and \$20,000 were spent on Northville's playground.

For the current work at Northville Community Park, Gans explained that pledges of nearly \$50,000 have been secured from Northville soccer and baseball programs.

"Everyone's been such a big help to us, and we definitely appreciate their support," Gans said.

# Dance craze sweeps through area

The community's interest gives Kallio hope that formal dancing will gain over free-style.

"Free-style dancing has been around for a long time because people don't have to make any effort or investment. Swing dancing is infinitely harder," Kallio said. "If you learn how to dance and you like it, you'll probably find some way to dance your whole life."

So many teens called looking for classes before the Homecoming Dance that the rec center is planning a special teen workshop in the spring.

Junior Mindy Marburger confirmed that swing has made inroads at Northville High School

within the last year.

"Since more bands have come out with that kind of music, it's in," Marburger said.

Partnered in the class with her friend Alex Christopoulos, Marburger learned the lead role, which will make it easier for her to teach the dance steps to both guys and girls.

"We were at a party and someone put on swing. We tried but since we learn to country music, it was a little fast."

Since her students are of different abilities, Kallio uses different styles of music to vary the dance tempo, including some songs from the country line dance class she also teaches.

To make the next session of swing lessons suitable for both beginner and intermediate dancers, Kallio said she'll teach at a beginning level, but stress different moves.

Some couples that progressed quickly during the fall session said the class gave them a great foundation, and readied them for more advanced instruction.

"The class teaches you the basic steps. From what you learn there you can go on and get more advanced moves. You can do nothing but improve," said Jim Grove, 26.

His partner, Rebecca Emerson, agreed.

But Emerson expects to see other dance trends gain popularity as well.

"I think the general trend is couple's dancing. It's not just swing, but I think swing is close to rock and that's why it's getting more publicity," Emerson said.

"Couples dancing is back." # New court project runs into some snags

The good news: bids are being accepted for contractors to build the new 35th District Court.

The worrisome news: If bids come back far in excess of the \$7.2 million estimated construction costs, a re-design of the building will need to be made.

And the bad news: even if a bid comes back within the financial parameters, the project probably won't be finished until the summer of 2000.

Combined, those three elements were making Judge Ron Lowe rather nervous.

"Everything right now is in such a state of flux," Lowe said Friday. "It's a real period of uncertainty for us."

Bids are due back to the court building authority by Dec. 10. Once the bids are returned, it's a matter of finding a bidder that both the bond advisory board and building authority find acceptable. A timetable set up by the authority calls for an awarding of the bid

sometime in either late December or early January.

But given the gung-ho nature of the construction trade, Lowe said some are beginning to have serious doubts that the building as planned can come to fruition within its present budget.

"The concern we have now is that we're not the only job out there looking for a bid," Lowe said. "The health of the economy is making the cost of some projects go way up."

Plans call for the new court to be constructed on the same land as the old court at Haggerty and Plymouth Roads. Compared to the old

court, it will have one additional courtroom and be situated on levels, plus a basement-level records storehouse.

The original courthouse was destroyed in a July 1997 fire caused by a powerful electrical storm. Before setting up shop in its present location at Five Mile and Cherry Hill roads, the court had held session in several communities the court services.

The court is one of the busiest in the state, handling thousands of cases each year.

The court was able to lease the land upon which the court is now operating from nearby Unisys. The

company gave the court a lease which will run through November of next year.

An extension of the lease to the court is entirely dependent on what happens with the sale of the land, according to Lowe. If a buyer for the Five/Cherry Hill property is found, any lease established with the court would be set up with a new business partner.

"We're sort of like the in-law and you don't know how long they'll be staying over," Lowe said. "The only guarantee in this is that come November of 1999, we'll have to reexamine our lease."

## New high school design plans on display at district library

Today, the new Northville High School on Six Mile Road is little more than rumbling trucks and detention ponds, but community members can tour the facility by visiting the Northville District Library in November.

Through the end of the month, design boards created by architectural firm Fanning & Howey Associates are on display in the library's main showcase.

The boards offer samples of design elements selected by the high school's Design Team which is coordinated by Assistant

Superintendent David Bolltho and Fanning & Howey Associates' designer Diane VanderVrede.

Color schemes and surface textures are illustrated with floor tile, carpet, and fabric samples arranged on design boards representing the four main sections of the school. The display also includes a detailed floor plan of the school.

The new Northville High School is scheduled to open in the fall of 2000. It is located on Six Mile Road between Sheldon and Beck Roads.

# Mayors criticize Bullard's support of revenue sharing

Sen. Bill Bullard Jr., R-Milford, voted last June for a drastic change in the state's revenue sharing formula to favor townships. And Bullard refused to back down when 10 southern Oakland County mayors visited him in Lansing.

"Any change will take away from Detroit," the first-term senator and former township supervisor said in the polite Nov. 12 confrontation in the State Capitol.

"I have a track record of sympathy to Detroit and older urban areas," he said, citing the tax program to help Detroit expand its Cobo Hall convention center.

The mayors, however, urged Bullard to work for a new formula

that doesn't shift money from Detroit and Pontiac to rural townships, thus subsidizing urban sprawl.

"Townships don't pave roads," said Novi Mayor Kathleen McLallen. "And we serve as a regional center, with a regional mall, exhibition center and commuter traffic."

"We're concerned about Detroit and Pontiac," said Farmington Hills Mayor Aldo Vagnozzi. "In the long run, we will become an older city, too."

"They (townships) don't have the same costs," protested Southfield Mayor Donald Fracassi, whose city's population triples as people from many towns come to work in offices there during the day.

"Two-thirds of townships don't provide anything in the way of police protection," said Dan Gilmartin, lobbyist for the Michigan Municipal League and former Livonia resident.

"Troy is anxious for money, but not at the expense of its neighbors," said Mayor Jeanne Stine.

The cities argue that most townships provide little more than volunteer fire departments, rarely police departments, more rarely libraries and parks. So townships don't need the money.

Moreover, say the mayors, cities find it costlier to replace 70-year-old water mains. Giving the money to townships would encourage paving of greenfields.

But Bullard said legislators are

looking at other ways to help Detroit besides giving it the lion's share of state shared revenue.

"Detroit is a big winner under Proposal C (the voter approved \$675 million environmental bond issue)," he said.

"Look at West Bloomfield Township in my Senate district," Bullard added. "It's almost indistinguishable from a city. I'd like to help urban areas in other areas - not necessarily revenue sharing."

State revenue sharing began in 1971. Chief revenue source is 15 percent of the first 4 percent of the sales tax. Total pot is \$1.4 billion.

The Senate in June passed SB 1811 by Glenn Stell, R-Grand Rapids, to correct what outstate

Michigan considers a rank injustice: Detroit with 10 percent of the state's population gets 25 percent of the pot.

Stell and the GOP argue that the 1971 formula, still in effect, rewards "relative tax effort" - subsidizing cities that impose high taxes for inefficient bureaucracies.

Stell's SB 1811 shifts to a per-capita formula. It won 30-6 Senate approval, winning all Republican votes and more than half of the Democrats. But Stell's bill has received no action in the House Tax Policy Committee, controlled by Democrats and chaired by Kirk Profit, D-Ypsilanti.

Detroit lawmakers support House Bill 5989, sponsored by Nick Ciaramitaro, D-Roseville. It

follows population by awarding growth in revenue on a per-capita basis.

Here is how the bills would impact various kinds of local units, according to the Independent Citizens Research Council:

- Townships - \$91 million more under Stell; \$41 million more under Ciaramitaro.
- Cities - \$96 million less under Stell; \$45 million less under Ciaramitaro. The Stell bill would cost Detroit \$143 million, but help many suburban and outstate cities. Stell calls Farmington Hills, in particular, a winner under his bill.
- Villages - \$5.1 million more under Stell; \$4.7 million more under Ciaramitaro.

be published within 30 days. Zaas did not comply and the libel suit was filed.

"Can you imagine having accusations that you performed somehow inadequately as an administrator spread throughout all kinds of media outlets including The Free Press, wire outlets, TV and so forth and how that may very well affect your career as an administrator and how people look at you?" Miglio asked. "As of today we have not received any apology or any retraction from the Zaas family to rescind the statements they made in the media about Dr. Anderson."

No monetary amount is specified on the libel suit.

"The question of what damage he suffered as a result of the claims they made and repeated would be up to the jury," Miglio said. "We'll just have to wait and see what happens as time goes by."

Zaas' attorneys Craig Essensmacher and Pamela Beeghly, could not be reached for comment.

School officials have expressed frustration that Zaas' accusations made the front page and were carried by local television news programs.

Even CNN and Good Morning America followed up on her story.

Yet they did not see the same coverage when Steeh dismissed the case on the grounds that Anderson was protected by governmental immunity and did not show gross negligence.

# Cassis may be key player in tax policy committee

Rep. Nancy Cassis has two special pages in House Speaker-elect Chuck Perricone's scrapbook.

"I want the original copy. I didn't know what you were going to say until you said it. It was great," said Perricone. R-Kalamazoo, whom Cassis had nominated during the 57-member caucus of the House GOP class of 1998.

"Quite an orator," agreed Rep.

Gerald Law, R-Plymouth, patting Cassis on the back. "And she's going to do great things on tax policy."

Perricone was picked over Rep. Mark Jansen of Grand Rapids in the closed-door, secret vote of Republican members-elect on Nov. 10.

Cassis, R-Nowi, didn't seek a leadership post, but don't be surprised if she lands a key role on the House Tax Policy Committee through a Perricone appointment.

"A family man, a skillful fighter for our Republican caucus, a true friend and a charismatic leader" is how she described Perricone, 38, who will lead the House in 1999-2000.

"Yes, at times forthright - some would say blunt - but with a frankness that lets you know

what's on his mind," she went on. "From the beginning, my class benefited from his inclusive style when he brought us together two years ago and urged us to come together."

Cassis, finishing her first full term in the House after service on the Novi City Council, revealed it was Perricone who gave her "the shove" to challenge Democrats in 1997-8 on the hot topic of income tax cuts.

Democrats preferred cuts targeted to specific segments of the population. Cassis pushed the Republican agenda - an across-the-board personal income tax cut of 0.1 percent per year until the rate drops to 3.9 percent after five years. Result: a stalemate, with no tax cut.

The GOP's takeover on Nov. 3

will put Cassis in the center of the 1999 tax cut drive.

"Isn't this the mark of a leader? Someone who can bring us together, listen, roll out the welcome mat, open the door to our individual and collective strengths?" a fired-up Cassis told the caucus.

"For the past two years," Perricone said, "our hands have been tied as the Democrat-controlled House turned its back on Michigan families and taxpayers. On Nov. 3, state voters said enough is enough."

Perricone, himself an accountant, has a reputation as a hard-nosed partisan who will be less inclined to compromise and prefer to use his 57-53 majority to flatten the opposition with the GOP caucus agenda.

In an interview afterwards, Cassis noted that the new set of leaders has far more diversity than past Republican charts with their heavy emphasis on Grand Rapids and Holland members.

"How's this for diversity?" she said, pointing to Andy Raczowski of Farmington Hills as majority floor leader, Speaker pro tem Patricia Birkholz of Saugatuck, associate speakers pro tem Judith Scranton of Brighton and Bruce Patterson of Canton; assistant floor leaders Mary Ann Middaugh of Paw Paw and Paul DeWeese of Williamston, caucus chair John Pappageorge of Troy, and assistant caucus chair Charles LaSata of St. Joseph.

Some are new to the Legislature. All but Perricone are new to the leadership, which has turned over

as term limits took effect.

Aiding Perricone in the transition will be a familiar Oakland County face - Suzanne Miller Allen, raised in Farmington Hills. As a Young Republican 10 years ago, she drove national convention delegates to and from the Dallas airport.

Later she worked for Sen. (now Lt. Gov.) Dick Posthumus on the Senate Commerce Committee, then for Rep. Paul Hillegonds when he was House speaker in 1995-6.

When the transition is finished, Allen will move onto the staff of Sen.-elect Ken Sikkema, R-Grandville, the former House minority leader. Her husband, Jason Allen, is the representative-elect from the Traverse City district.

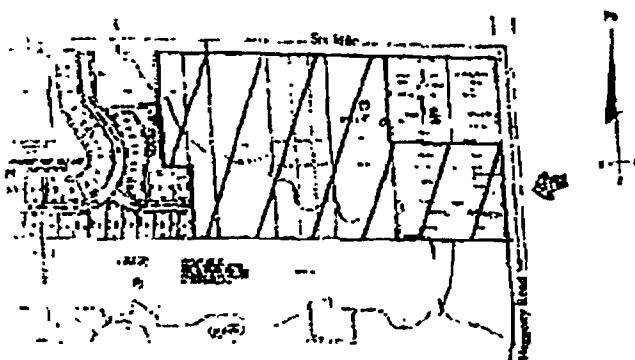

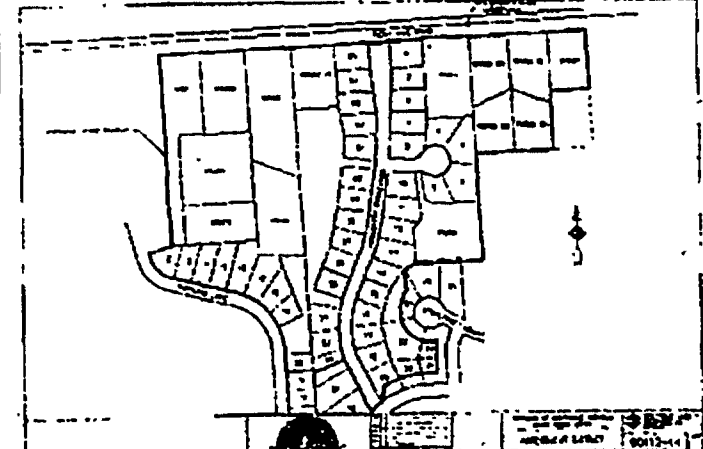

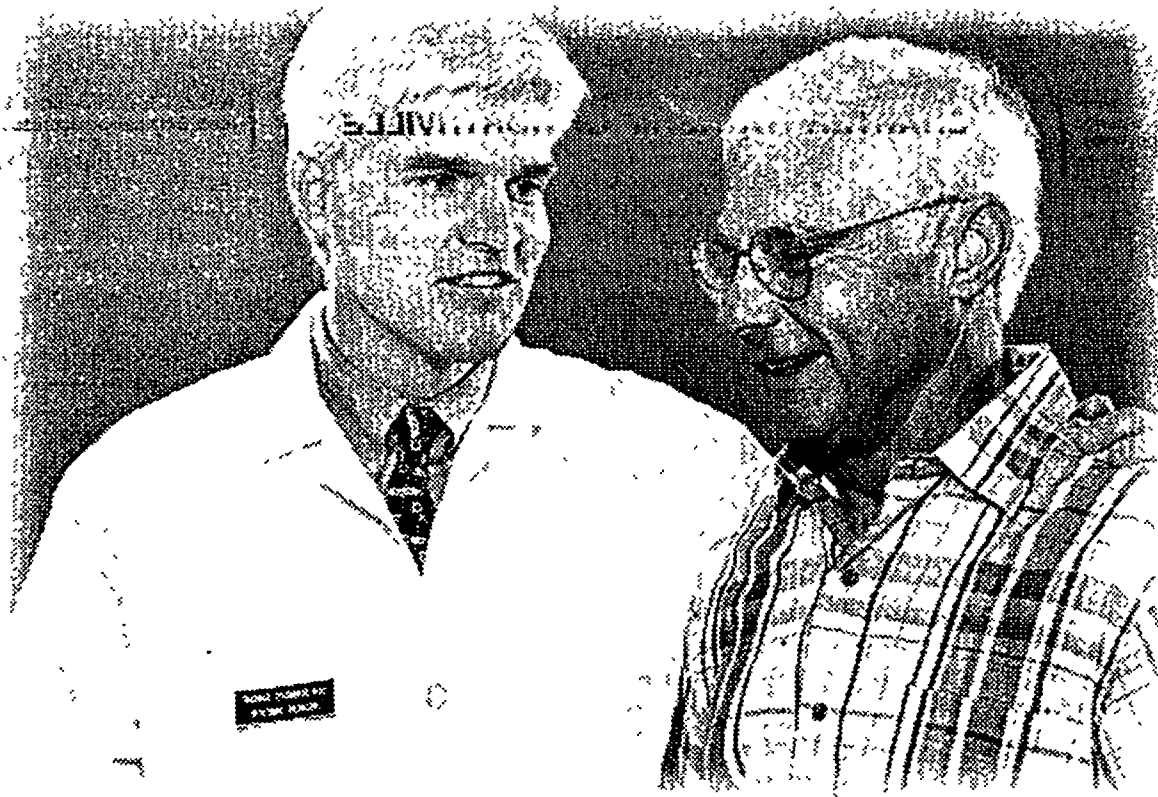

# Local family helps storm relief effort

Hurricane Mitch struck thousands of miles from Northville's borders, but local residents are finding a way to help the storm victims nonetheless.

Reading news reports of the more than 10,000 people who died and the hundreds of thousands who saw their homes destroyed in the storm, a Northville Township family was quickly inspired to help.

"I read an article that said parents in Central America were putting children in the trees and on their roofs so they wouldn't be washed away. Then their parents would be washed away and they'd be left there," said Armen Kabodian. "It just tore up my heart as a parent how awful that situation was there. They didn't have much to begin with and now they have all that devastation. We just had to

do something."

Kabodian got on the Internet and located a company that was initiating hurricane relief.

Empire Electronics, a Troy manufacturer with a facility in Honduras, was planning to send a 40-foot sea chest to Port Cortez to be distributed by their Honduran employees.

The company set up three collection points in the Detroit Metro Area, and Kabodian and his wife Belinda soon joined the effort.

By browsing the web, faxing flyers and approaching local businesses, Kabodian said he merely provided a spark that ignited an outpouring of generosity in the community.

"I really didn't do much," Kabodian said. "It was just raising people's awareness of what they could do to help. It's been wonderful seeing everyone's willingness to give. God's blessed us with so many

things."

Donations of blankets, shoes, clothing, toothbrushes and household items came pouring in from the community.

Families at Thornton Creek Elementary School, where Ariana Kabodian, 6, is a student joined the effort, as did families at Northville's William Allen Academy where Margaux, 5, attends.

Novi/Northville Montessori school, where the girls have morning schooling, also became a collection point.

"We always talk to our daughters about how fortunate we are, that we should always remember what we have and not worry about what we don't have," Kabodian said. "They have been so excited to see things arrive."

In addition, the Kabodian's secured gift certificates from Hiller's Shopping Center Market, Meijer, Target and Novi's Interof-

fice, which they used to purchase over-the-counter medications and other necessities.

Northville dentist William Demray offered up bagfuls of toothbrushes and sample toothpastes.

By the time Empire came to pick up the supplies on Saturday, the Kabodian's entire three-car garage was filled with goods.

"It was just amazing. I was just overwhelmed," Kabodian said. "Empire sent a pick-up truck, because they didn't expect so much. We ended up taking eight loads, in my wife's minivan, neighbors' minivans, my Sable. We caravanned it all over to Empire."

Empire Electronics corralled enough donations to fill four sea chests, and will use \$1,000 in checks raised in Northville to help with transportation costs.

The first shipment was sent Nov. 18.

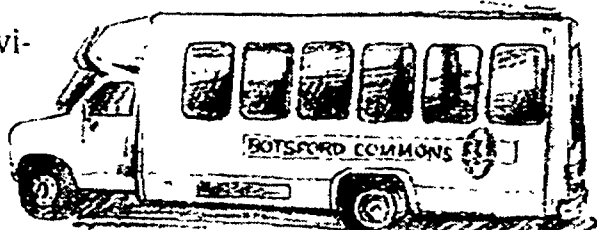

# Millenium question: is your gravestone Y2K compatible?

As government and business employees scramble to get their computers Y2K compatible, some people are facing a more low tech problem with the approach of the year 2000.

Namely people who pre-purchased tombstones with "19—" engraved as the year of their death - that now find themselves alive and well at the turn of the century.

Although Sue Senne, a receptionist at Northville's Inch Memorials, hasn't taken any calls from people concerned about the problem, she said she's sure they're out there.

"I don't know if they're panicking yet," Senne said. "But when the year 2000 rolls around, we'll see."

Senne will have to deal with the quandary herself. Senne's grandmother ordered her tombstone at age 56, when her husband died in 1958.

Although she inscribed the year of her death in the 20th century, with the year 2000 just 13 months away, she is 97 years old.

"She doesn't plan on going anywhere anytime soon," Senne said of Edith Trombley, who lives in Botsford Commons in Farmington Hills. "She's not worried about it."

She'll leave it for the grand kids to deal with."

Senne's boss may be able to help.

Richard Cardinal, owner of Inch Memorials at 580 S. Main St., said although no one has approached him yet to fix a stone, the memorial business is well aware of the problem.

To avoid it, he said, forward-thinkers stopped engraving "19—" on stones decades ago.

"When I started in this business at 16, we were no longer putting 19 on markers in 1968. If people were 60 or 70 years old then, chances are they're not alive today, but some are," he said.

The easiest remedy is to cover the date with a bronze plaque, engraved with the year of passing and affixed to the granite stone.

Another option is to fill the "19" with a resin and powder mixture that matches the stone. When it hardens, the stone can be reengraved.

Employees for Inch Memorials can do both procedures on-site for about \$200, depending on the size of the job and the type of granite.

"The problem is, granite will last forever," Cardinal said. "The

repairs won't."

Resin, for example, can discolor or crack. Bronze plates may corrode or loosen.

What about shaving off the face of the stone and recarving it?

Like complex electronic equipment, extensive repairs cost more than replacing stones, Cardinal explained.

"The only permanent solution is to get a new stone entirely," he said. "But who's responsible for it?"

Granite has replaced marble and sandstone as the material of choice for burial monuments, making up about 98 percent of markers.

At his showroom and workshop (which still bears the Allen Monuments sign from the previous owner), Cardinal sandblasts names and patterns onto pre-cut and polished stone delivered from around the world.

Whether customers opt for a new stone or a simple repair, Cardinal said he can help the living solve the problem of a misengraved stone.

"Let us take a look and we will recommend to you the proper way to do it," he added.

Beginning Friday night, downtown shops will stay open until 8

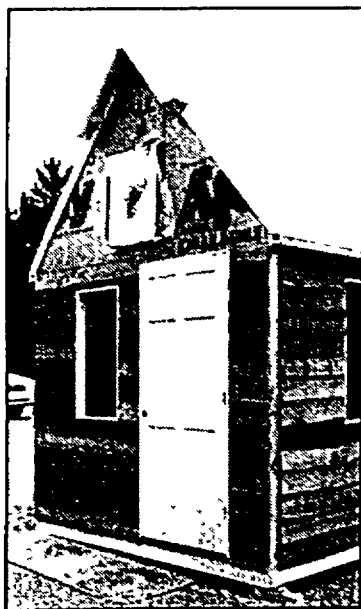

# City public hearing scheduled to discuss dual water meters

A Dec. 7 public hearing was scheduled Monday by the Northville city council to hear from residents on the controversial issue of dual water meters.

A proposal drafted by city administration would allow residents the option of purchasing a second water meter, through which water used for outdoor purposes would be measured. Though admittedly not a cure-all, the dual meter idea was considered the best partial solution to the long-standing city problem of high water rates — among the highest of those towns hooked into the Detroit water network.

The plan would place no restrictions on the number of homes which would be able to participate in the program. If adopted, the city would eliminate 66 percent of the sanitary sewer bill for the second meter.

A straw poll taken at the meeting by mayor Chris Johnson showed that no serious opposition to the proposal existed on the council, except for council member Kevin Hartshorne, who blasted the idea in a three-minute prepared statement.

Hartshorne, who had been an outspoken critic of the proposal since it was first discussed last spring, suggested the plan came close to government-sponsored extortion, and even read aloud the definition of "extortion" from the dictionary.

"Is water a commodity or a resource?" Hartshorne asked. "This new policy could only have an adverse effect on our hot summer days."

He further attacked the plan for its potential threat to the city's fire-fighting ability and for the risk it posed to the city's water budget in the future. He said the city's finances could be skewed severely if greater than five percent of residents signed on for a second meter.

City staff made drew their financial model based on that five percent participation rate. If a greater number of residences signed on for the program than that, sewer rates would continue to climb for those who did not have a second meter.

City manager Gary Word said that based on the best information available, the city would be able to work its way through the financial hurdles associated with a dual meter system.

"We're assuming there's a sort of pent-up demand for this type of thing," Word said, adding that he believed once the opportunity was made available, residents would take advantage of it.

The city of Northville is billed by the city of Detroit and Wayne County for water which flows into homes and for the cost of pumping wastewater into the sanitary sewer system. Those who favored a second meter argue that water used for car washing or lawn irrigation was percolating into the soil and not re-entering the system for treatment, making it unreasonable

to pay for a service not being given.

Opponents, however, claim that those who don't use a large amount of water in the out-of-doors would be stuck paying the bill for those who do. In addition, they point out that groundwater enters certain breaks in the city water system and is treated without having been paid for.

That was also the argument from one person in attendance at the meeting, who said senior citizens on fixed incomes would be the ones most likely hurt by a dual meter program.

The council has long struggled with the question of how best to address the controversial issue. Opponents claim a dual meter program — used in no other metro Detroit community besides Farmington — gives a financial break to a small number of homeowners at the expense of everyone else.

About a dozen homes in Northville already utilize two water meters, a leftover vestige from an attempt to implement a dual meters in the 1980s.

The new dual meter plan would also mandate three fees to be paid for the second meter. Residents would be required to purchase a plumbing permit, a dual meter inspection fee and a recording / bill processing fee. The plan would also give the city's department of Public Works the right to enter any building — at reasonable hours — where a dual meter is utilized to verify that no violations are taking place.

that is causing us problems," he said. "We're very good in that respect."

Another culprit in shortchanging the sewer billing process had to do with home foundations which drained directly into the sewer system, Gallogly said.

While many homes where downspouts lead underground have been found, a few remain, he said.

Gallogly said a special smoke can be introduced into the sewer system which would exit along at the base of a house's foundation, thereby revealing which homes are connected to the network.

He said Lexington Commons residences were particularly notorious for having homes which drained directly into the sewer system.

To counter the stormwater-sewer problem, Gallogly briefly mentioned the possibility — albeit an expensive one — of constructing a temporary holding facility where overflow amounts of water could be held and released into the sewer system so as not to burden the county network.

Mayor protem Carolann Ayers proposed the idea of making capital improvements a millage item rather than being tacked on as part of a resident's water bill.

She said going at infrastructural changes in that manner would be advantageous when income tax time comes around.

"A well-maintained infrastructure is good for everyone," Ayers said.

The rate increase hearing will occur at the same meeting where a second hearing dealing with dual water meters has been scheduled. Water and sewer service rate changes are not required by charter to be open to a public hearing, but Word noted that the city has historically opened up such changes to public comment.

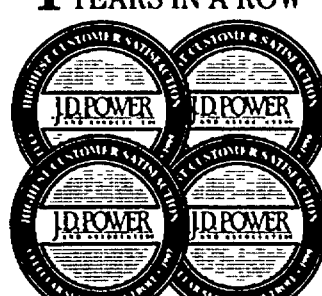

### Media did hatchet job on Anderson/Zaas lawsuit

More than a year ago, a barrage of media attention focused on Northville's Amerman Elementary School and Amerman Principal Stephen Anderson.

Why?

Because a Northville woman filed a lawsuit that said he physically attacked her.

Robin Zaas said Anderson ignored the repeated abuse of her daughter Stephanie, then 8, by two of her classmates.

She also said he shouldn't have allowed Stephanie's second-grade teacher to present a book about her pregnancy without getting permission from parents.

That's sexy stuff for front page and TV news.

Camera crews and news reporters interviewed Robin Zaas at her home and publicized her allegations, then swarmed Anderson and superintendent Leonard Rezmierski for reaction.

Two weeks ago, the lawsuit was dismissed from U. S. Circuit Court by Judge George Steeh, who wrote in an opinion that the counts would not hold up in court.

Instead of front page coverage of what could be construed as Anderson's vindication, the story was placed on the back page of the metro section of *The Detroit Free Press*.

The TV news crews didn't run for a follow-up at all.

The same media that gave voice to Zaas' allegations failed to cover the fact that a judge deemed her claims meritless.

School officials are left wondering "Where is the attention now?"

Still on the court docket is a counter suit that Anderson filed against Zaas.

The suit claims Zaas defamed Anderson's character and portrayed him in a false light.

It alleges that Zaas sought out media coverage for untrue statements that have since damaged Anderson's personal and professional reputation and caused him pain and suffering, embarrassment and emotional distress.

Lawyers for Anderson demanded a jury trial before federal court.

Although it is doubtful that Anderson will win much in damages, we are doubtful that money is the point.

Going back to court is one of the only official avenues Anderson can take to clear his name in the public eye.

There is little doubt that Zaas' allegations did indeed damage Anderson's reputation.

Although parents of children at Amerman mobilized in support of their principal, signed petitions and wrote letters of encouragement, that side of the story didn't get much press beyond Northville's borders.

Neither did the fact that Anderson has two master's degrees and doctorate degree in education leadership from the University of Arizona, was a family therapist for Catholic Social Services and taught "Parenting and Psychology" at Cochise College in Arizona.

Anderson is a principal who prides himself on his school's parenting library, after-school parenting classes and an extensive program to foster children's self-esteem.

Although it is important to thoroughly explore any claims of abuse or irresponsible teaching practices within our public schools, we don't feel that local media conducted such investigations.

Instead, they descended for a quick story, spread bad press about Anderson and the Northville Public Schools and never looked back.

### When it comes to water we're in it up to our necks

We'll be the first to say that the Northville city council's proposal of a dual water meter system isn't particularly grand.

We'll also tell you that we agree with council member Kevin Hartshorne's criticisms of the plan: financial risk, a threat to fire control and possible lack of fairness in billing to residents.

And we'll also say that we think Northville should look more closely at joining hands with other communities in taking on Wayne County to force sewer billing to be done more fairly.

At the same time, we happen to believe the dual water meter system is the most attractive of several unattractive options to bringing fairness to the city's water billing, and encourage the city to move ahead with it.

Ask to take a look at the water and sewer bills for residents in surrounding communities, and it almost guaranteed to be lower than what we're paying in Northville. Public works director Jim Gallogly has told the city council it's a problem which can be attributed to an aging local water system and the billing methods set up by county officials. In either case, they are hurdles which can only be overcome with a substantial financial and time investment.

To the city's credit, a long-term plan to repair the Northville system has been budgeted for, pledging \$1.5

million through 2005 to patch leaks and replace broken sections. It's still a long way off from the engineering study which said more than \$4 million in repairs are needed, but it's a respectable start in a community with a relatively small budget.

Taking on the county is a different animal altogether, and as mayor Chris Johnson indicated Monday, without neighboring communities linking up with Northville, forcing billing fairness through a courtroom could be an arduous task to accomplish.

Which, for the time being, leaves us with the dual meter program. It's a policy Northville can implement on its own and provide some measure of relief to those who use the garden hose in warmer weather. We agree: there's no reason those people should be paying a sewer treatment fee for water that isn't going into the sewer.

It would be like being billed for a dessert you never ordered at a restaurant and the waiter telling you the restaurant charges for dessert automatically.

We suspect Mr. Hartshorne will be proven partially correct with some of his doubts, and the city will be proven partially correct with some of its more optimistic appraisals. We're certain this plan won't be without its snags, but the city's first and foremost duty is to provide its residents the services they pay for.

## Business coverage is 'good enough'

Not good enough.

That's a phrase I'm getting tired of hearing, and one that keeps coming out of the mouths of downtown merchants and people representing local civic organizations.

They're referring to newspaper coverage, of course. Not a week goes by when someone calls to ask if the paper could write a story about a funding raising event, or take a photo of the 10-year anniversary of a business.

Nine out of 10 times I'm quick to comply with the request. After all, I have made it a priority for our newspaper to publicize the things going on in our downtown business district. That's what we're supposed to be doing as a Hometown newspaper, and I have no complaints about carrying out that responsibility.

So when I get that type of a request I usually hand it over to a reporter or photographer and place the story or photo in the newspaper.

That's when the complaints begin. "I didn't like the photo, and I want you to have your photographer shoot another one to run in next week's paper," a merchant recently requested.

"We appreciate the space you gave us in the paper, but in our estimation (the coverage) didn't live up to what we expected. We're extremely disappointed," wrote another business owner about a story and two photos that ran last August.

"Why did you place us on the bottom of the front page?" asked another.

"Your coverage wasn't good enough. There has been no noticeable change in customer traffic in our store," one

merchant told me during several phone conversations.

Not good enough?

Since when was the newspaper required to personally escort customers into our downtown shops?

I'm sorry but I pride myself in involving myself and this newspaper with merchants, merchants associations, civic groups, and charitable foundations. My reporters are not only responsible to report the news, they are required to get involved, to become a part of the community they cover.

I think we do an outstanding job, and I'm proud to say that this newspaper has come a long way in promoting Northville.

As a matter of fact I'd love to hear the response from editors of the Detroit dailies to a request for front page coverage of the grand opening of a Northville business.

After the editor stopped laughing the conversation might sound something like this: "I'm sorry ma'am but you see the president has up and given the order to attack Iraq, and gosh we're

really sorry but we can't spare a reporter to cover your grand opening."

You see, there's a difference in the mission of a community newspaper. We're genuinely interested in those grand openings, and I have absolutely no problem with placing them on my front page.

So when we do feature a business or civic group I get a bit confused when the response is "not good enough." To me, not good enough would mean ignoring downtown merchants altogether, or refusing to provide coverage for the Taste of Northville Business Showcase, or saying no to the Goodfellows or Salvation Army.

Worse yet, it would mean not printing one word about the annual Victorian Festival or upcoming Lighted Christmas Parade.

All of those things deserve coverage, as do the comings and goings of downtown merchants or civic organizations.

And for the record, we don't seek anything in return. We don't expect a word of thanks when we provide that coverage, nor do we seek a pat on the back or praise for doing our jobs.

But by the same token don't make the mistake of complaining about the size of a headline, the crop of a photo, the placement of a story, or the number of words the story contains.

Because for me, those complaints just aren't good enough to affect positive change in the way we cover our community.

## It's time to lower the Decibels

As a teacher, I found that, according to your sons and daughters, you parents "yell" a lot. "Mom yelled" at me for my report card. "My dad yelled" at me for being late. "My parents yell" at me all the time.

Now ballplayers "yell" at umpires sometimes and hog callers certainly "yell." But parents yelling? All the time?

Let's subtract some of teenage exaggeration and theatrics. The "yell" isn't really a "yell," but maybe more of a "nag," which has somewhat fewer decibels, and the amount of yelling might come far closer to "never" than to "always." Still, there may be far more yelling in our homes than most of us feel comfortable with.

So today's lesson is on how to reduce the yelling in any given house, especially the yelling directed towards the teenagers who live there.

Obviously there are many reasons to yell at kids. So what we are suggesting here probably won't end all the yelling. It will, however, get at a major cause of friction in most teen-inhabited homes.

The trick seems simple enough: be proactive, not reactive.

Most of us are reactive parents. That is, we tend to react to our children's behavior. The teen comes in late so we yell and announce a permanent grounding, which everyone knows means being grounded until it's forgotten in two days or until the teen worms his or her way back into our

affections. It's just a matter of time before the late pattern is repeated and the yelling and grounding are repeated, probably with the yelling increasing in volume in direct ratio to the frustration. The point is, nothing gets changed except the anger, which grows with each repeated pattern.

We need to become proactive parents. This means anticipating the behavior and having a set consequence for it. If our son comes in late, we might comment on it but ignore any punishment the first time. But the next morning, in a very pleasant voice (remember, this is going to cure most yelling), tell the wayward kid that you were concerned about the late hours and that the next time he comes in after his curfew he will lose his driver's license for a week. Make it very clear that you will take his license away for a week, no doubt about it.

Here's tip about consequences: they have to be something the teen does not appreciate. A sentence to an evening in a room with a TV, boom box, computer, and phone is a reward

to some teens.)

Then when he comes in late next time - and he will, kids love to test rules - you can be very apologetic about the whole thing. As you relieve him of his license and keys, you tell him how sorry you are that he chose to behave in a way that lost his driving privileges because you know how much the car means to him.

You are now on his side, arguing his case, listening to his weak reasons, and not yelling. He knew the consequences when he decided to be late. You can point this out to him if he protests.

Reply to his protests by noticing his feelings - this gets a lot of tension out of the way. "I can see that you are upset that you won't be driving for a week. I feel upset about it too. Why would you choose to be a pedestrian when you could be driving?"

Here is the anti-yelling plan again in a nut-shell: Notice a behavior you don't like. Don't punish the first time you notice it. Instead, set the consequence for the next time the behavior is repeated. (Make a list of consequences for your ready reference. You never know when you'll need them.) Now when the behavior reoccurs, be sympathetic with the teen because of the consequences that he has chosen. You are baffled why anyone would decide not to use the phone for three days or to lose the stereo for a week or to lose an allowance or to stay in the house over the weekend.

# State Dems need to begin reformation

The caller was a well-known columnist for a Detroit daily newspaper.

"Things can scarcely get worse for the Democratic Party," he started off. "First, Fieger gets whopped by Engler. Then Democrats lose the House and their working majority on the Supreme Court. Come New Year's, the Republicans will be in control of the entire apparatus of state government. When are ordinary people going to take the party back from the UAW?"

Good question. It's especially good because the folks atop organized labor in Michigan continue to refuse to speak to reporters from either Detroit daily newspapers on the grounds that the newspapers conducted unfair labor practices in winning the strike. "No scab newspapers" conveniently means not having to answer potentially embarrassing questions from curious reporters.

Those Democrats who do speak to reporters are generally unanimous in asserting that their party needs to be "revitalized," a code word meaning easing the organized labor's strangle hold. Non-labor party activists have been complaining for years that organized labor would rather control the party apparatus top to bottom rather than share power and win elections.

It was not always thus. Way back in the 1950s, Democratic Party Chairman Neil Staebler, Gov. G. Mennen Williams and UAW President Walter Reuther worked out a kind of collective leadership for the party. Organized labor had a seat at the table, to be sure, but other groups - blacks, women, farmers, even business and professional people - also sat in. Decisions might be contentious, but no one group dominated.

It worked. Democrats experienced great success for more than a decade. Then gradually for organized labor and especially in the UAW, the idea got around that it was more "responsible" for labor to run things directly without going through the inconvenient process of consultation.

The problem now for reform-minded Democrats is they lack a suitable forum in which to discuss their grievances and work out a plan to take back their party.

The traditional way political parties reach conclusions is by holding conventions, ostensibly a gathering of all party members, whose decisions would be binding on the leadership. But organized labor still dominates party conventions - often by paying members to attend and bussing cadres to convention sites and putting them up in hotels.

One method might be to adopt a system used in England to great effect by Tony Blair while he was wrenching the Labor Party out of the thrall of organized labor and convert-

ing it into a successful, middle class party.

The Labor Party operates through conventions, much like our own parties, but there is also something called the Parliamentary Labor Party, consisting of all Labor Members of Parliament. Unlike the British trade unions, Labor Party MPs have a common and compelling interest in winning elections. In the English system, that's the only way they get the power to form a government.

Maybe Michigan Democrats should hold a convocation of all elected Democratic officeholders. Their overriding common bond - an interest in reforming the party so as to win elections - would provide them a good starting point to analyze what's going wrong with the Democratic Party. Their collective standing as Democratic officeholders might immunize them against retribution by organized labor.

Moreover, many Democratic Party officeholders are themselves members of unions. Their presence at a convocation would serve as proof that, as a practical matter, any move to reform the Michigan Democratic Party must include organized labor as an important part of the coalition.

For years now, organized labor has been at the center of the Michigan Democratic Party. The problem is that it has been a center without any circumference. Figuring out how to include other folks in is the essential first step in any process of reform.

# State Dems need to begin reformation

It's good to know that our beloved legislators - with prison populations, failing charter schools, public health and wetlands to worry about - can lighten up and contemplate more important things in life.

Each session day, a member of the Michigan House and Senate leads his/her respective chamber in prayer. On Nov. 10, it was the turn of Sen. Chris Dingell, D-Trenton, a devoted outdoorsman. His invocation, as printed in the Senate Journal:

"Lord, we give thanks for the seasons. Those of romance, planning, harvest and politics are past. Deer hunters give thanks that theirs is here at last.

"We hunt deer because we love to, and we love the environs where deer are found, which is invariably beautiful.

"Because all the television commercials, cocktail parties and assorted social posturing we have to endure that we will escape.

"Because in a world where most men seem to spend their lives doing things they hate, our hunting is at once an endless source of delight and an act of small rebellion.

"Because deer do not lie or cheat and cannot be bought or bribed or impressed by power, they respond to quietude, humility and endless patience.

"Because we suspect that people are going along this way for the last time, we don't want to waste the trip. Mercifully there are no telephones in most deer blinds, certainly not mine, because only in the woods can we find solitude without loneliness; because libations out of an old tin cup taste better out there.

"And finally, not because we regard hunting

as being so terribly important, but because we suspect that so many of the other concerns are equally unimportant and nowhere near as much fun, we give thanks. Amen."

Dingell's prayer is not totally original. It's parodied from Robert Traver's "Trout Madness" which appeared in the 1960s. Traver was the pen name of John Voelker, who quit the state Supreme Court so he could return to his beloved trout ponds in God's country, area code 906, the Upper Peninsula. Voelker had his priorities straight.

One needn't be a hunter or trout fisherman to appreciate what Dingell and Traver are talking about. Although deer are fairly common, even in Wayne County, I count it a charmed day when I see one.

Somewhere I read that the Chippewa Indians said a prayer of tribute when they killed a deer or bear. They addressed the deer as "brother" and promised to use his meat and byproducts only for their own nourishment and shelter,

never for wastage. I suspect Dingell's invocation was written in the same spirit.

No longer do we have wolves to prey on the deer herds, control their numbers and cull the weak ones. Either we let them overpopulate and starve, mow them down with our sport-utility vehicles, or hunt them graciously and with the reverence of the Chippewa.

# Record editor should consider all the facts

To the editor:

In your Nov. 5 editorial, you sharply criticized the board of education for approving contracts based on information which you strongly implied was not publicly available. In doing so, you failed to recognize that all of this information had been disclosed and discussed at several prior, public board subcommittee meetings and study sessions. This failure resulted in a factually incomplete editorial which misled your readership, and was the basis for my comments at the Nov. 10 board meeting.

In your Nov. 12 column, you finally acknowledged that the board had engaged in a public process, but stated that you had a continuing concern about the public being "properly notified" because they "don't always make those meetings." What is it you think the board should have done differently? Should we have engaged in a historic reenactment of all of our prior meetings before voting?

Your column also suggested that board members had "lost their minds" by approving "contracts that weren't complete." This statement fails to recognize that it is very common for the board to consider and approve only significant contract terms, and to leave it to the administration to "iron out the details." To do otherwise would cause the board to improperly take over an operational responsibility of the administration. In this case, the board properly approved all of the significant changes (mostly financial) from prior contracts with the understanding that the balance of the terms would remain the same when the new contracts were finally drafted and executed.

Your consideration of these additional facts is appreciated.

Northville Township resident Karen Groves is more than a co-worker — She's a friend. So, when she was diagnosed with cancer, the office pitched in to help ...

## Walk this Way

It was one of those things they couldn't, and wouldn't, sweep under the rug.

Cancer is a topic people don't want to talk about, especially in the workplace.

But since Northville Township resident Karen Groves' cancer came back, her co-workers at on-line graphics inc. have been there for her.

They organized a team of people to go on the breast cancer walk on Oct. 17 on Belle Isle to raise money and awareness of the disease.

They let Groves in on some of their plans, but not all of them, because they wanted to surprise her.

Being an organized person, which landed her the job at on-line graphics in the first place, she offered to help get things moving.

No, they told her, they could manage.

She, however, had her concerns. Groves had a few suggestions such as name tags, or wearing the same color T-shirts.

They just assured her again that everything would be fine.

Groves tried to reassure herself that they could manage to pull it off without her help.

"With her organizational abilities, I think it was tough (for her)," said Joan Blough, owner of on-line graphics.

The morning of the walk, Groves pulled up in her car. The day was warm, but overcast. The first person she saw was Blough, who had on a T-shirt she hadn't seen before.

"Wow, look at those t-shirts," Groves remembers thinking. "It was a shock, I cried."

All 21 people who walked the 4.7 miles donned the shirts written by co-worker and customer service representative Kristin Shrader. A big pink ribbon with "Team on-line graphics, inc." was imprinted on the front and "Making Strides Against Breast Cancer. I am walking for Karen Groves and the other 180,300 women and men diagnosed with Breast Cancer this year" on the back.

"It was a perfect day for walking," said Blough. "There was a little breeze blowing off the lake."

Groves was first diagnosed with breast cancer in July 1996.

When Debbie Pletzer, head designer, saw a flyer about the walk for breast cancer in a store, she thought it would be great if they could put together a team for Groves.

"I'd just been wanting to do something to feel like I could help her, because there's really nothing you can do when it's cancer except be a support," Pletzer said. "When I saw this I thought it would be a good way to show her how much we love her and care about her and a good thing to do for others, too."

### How can you help a co-worker who has cancer?

- Accept the person as they were and still are.

- Let them take the lead in talking about the disease. If they want to talk, be a good listener.

- Listen to what is said and how it is said as well as what is meant but not said. Give them realistic support and reassurance.

- Respect the wishes of those who choose not to talk about their illness. Others may want to talk about it one day and not another.

- Try to feel comfortable when there is a conversation full. People can sense discomfort in others. Silences can help focus our thoughts. Don't feel you

- have to say something.

- Touching, smiling, looks that convey affection show the co-worker that, even though they are ill, they have not changed in your eyes. "Cancer patients do not always want to think or talk about their disease. It adds to the quality of life to laugh and enjoy the things around you."

- Continue to involve the co-worker in activities now that you did before the diagnosis, if they are able.

- If they are off work, continue to visit or call, if you did so before the illness.

- Be yourself, don't worry about whether you are doing things "right."

Blough believes they raised several thousand dollars although "we didn't stop to count it."

Both Pletzer and Blough also have family members or friends who are battling breast cancer.

Groves had met Blough and Pletzer

many years ago but was asked to work for on-line graphics during a big project.

A few days later Groves told Blough

"you know you really do need me here."

Blough knew Groves had fought breast

cancer but that it was now history.

"I quite honestly didn't even think

about it," Blough said when hiring Groves as a project manager about a year ago.

"She is a great organizer and it's really made a difference. She's had a big impact on one portion of my business here that has been very important. It

was good that we maintain that in an orderly way. It's very complex and she came in and did a good job, saved a lot of headaches," Blough said.

Blough founded on-line graphics inc. 11 years ago out of her home and now employs nine people in an office tucked away behind the Plymouth Landing Restaurant in Plymouth.

"We don't talk about it every minute of the day but we do talk about it," Blough said. "We don't pretend it's not there and it's not serious, then we also have to work and make our living, and keep clients happy. It's a good distraction."

Prior to coming to on-line graphics, Groves had been a Northville Township clerk for one and a half years. She is taking a break from the Plymouth Theatre Guild for the time being. Groves figures she probably worked about 60 hours a week for 10 years straight for the theater group, seven of which as president.

"I need to focus on (my health) and my work," Groves said. "I'm doing fine with that."

Several months ago, when Groves received word that her cancer was back, she was home alone, but not for long. Blough and Pletzer wrapped up what they were doing at work, and drove to her home.

"There's always a major event in people's lives that hits, and you need accommodation to that," Blough said.

Pletzer had been told by Groves' friends that she didn't want to hear from her friends, but found out that was not true.

"Don't be afraid to embrace them and tell them you're there for them because they need that support," Pletzer said.

Blough said that although in a small business like on-line graphics it's hard to separate personal lives from business lives because they spend eight to 10 hours a day together, a larger company should be no different.

"We cry a lot but we laugh a lot too," Blough said. "We tease her. I think that that helps us all."

They rib her about never having a bad hair day.

"They're just jealous because I have a wig and I don't have to do my hair," Groves said.

Groves received word from her doctor on Oct. 27 that the new treatment she is receiving, which consists of chemotherapy, as well as a variety of drugs including the new FDA drug Herceptin, is working.

"I was like the second one at U-M to receive it," Groves said.

Groves has been married to Tom for 28 years.

"My husband is thrilled that I am doing this. He thinks it is the best thing for me and I agree," said Groves.

They couple have lived in Northville Township for 22 years and have a son and a daughter.

"I think that it's really important that people know they options they can do for other people in the workplace," Blough said. "There's a lot you can do in the workplace. I've seen it in bigger corporations where people will get ignored. It is so important that people deal with it and talk about it."

## Alumni to be contestant on show

If you watch "Jeopardy" on Wednesday, Nov. 25, you will see a familiar face. Randy Juip, a 1993 graduate of Novi High School, will be a contestant on the show.

"I've really enjoyed that show," said Juip who's watched "Jeopardy" since middle school. "I've always wanted to be a contestant on the show but never thought it was going to happen."

This past summer, Juip saw a notice tacked on to the end of a "Jeopardy" show announcing a contestant search in Detroit, the first time such a search had been held in Detroit for many, many years.

"When I saw that I was incredibly excited and fired off a postcard," said Juip, who lives in Detroit.

Juip received a letter saying he could participate a few weeks later.

On June 17, Juip went to the Renaissance Center in Detroit and was among 75 people who completed a 50 question written

exam on 50 different subjects.

"I knew they did tryouts in other cities but had never seen them do a tryout in Detroit," Juip said.

One of 15 who passed the test, he was then given a screen test, which included playing a game of Jeopardy.

"Just the preliminary examination was quite an experience," said Juip whose name was added to the contestant pool.

Juip was home one night studying evidence when the phone rang. On the other end of the line was a Jeopardy representative who asked him if he wanted to be a contestant.

Juip, along with his parents Brian and Micki, his sister Christy, and his girlfriend Maureen Hindelang, flew out to Culver City, Calif. for the Oct. 6 taping.

Unlike in the past when the television show paid the air fares for the contestants but did not guarantee them a spot, Juip said that this year the contestants paid their own air fare but were

guaranteed a spot.

So the Juip's made a vacation out of it. They went to Las Vegas the weekend before the Tuesday taping and then drove to Culver City.

"It was great," Juip said. "The trip was phenomenal."

Jeopardy's domestic audience is 17 million viewers, according to Juip.

"They told us that just before the taping so it was quite a bit of pressure knowing that there was 17 million viewers on the other side of the camera," said the first-time television contestant.

Contestants do not receive any notice as to the subjects at all, according to Juip.

"It was a lot more difficult than I thought it would be," Juip said. "When you sit at home you can answer the questions off the top of your head - no pressure. There is no science to the buzzer."

During the taping, the actual buzzer mechanism is hard to get working, according to Juip. Then there's the lights, television cameras and audience.

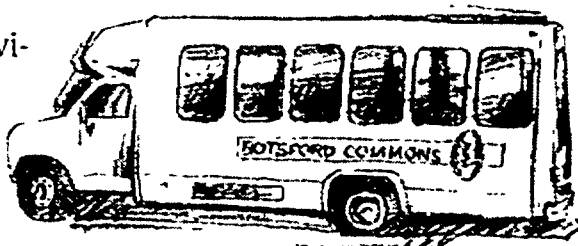

# Going home

Somewhere between Los Angeles and New York, student finds true meaning of Christmas

Jonathan Taylor Thomas stars as Jake Wilkinson, a self-absorbed college student, who, just days before Christmas awakens to find himself stranded in the middle of the California desert — wearing a Santa suit and a white beard glued to his face.

The butt of a pay-back by the football team who thinks he double-crossed them by not providing the correct answers to a finals exam, Jake has to find a way to get to New York by 6 p.m. on Christmas Eve — and catch up with his girlfriend Allie (Jessica Biel) who is on the road with the school stud Eddie (Adam Lavorgna) — or risk forfeiting the vintage Porsche his father (Gary Cole) promised if his son comes home for the holidays.

As Jake desperately hitchhikes his way east, everyone he meets unwittingly sets into motion a comedy of errors as they look to Santa for help and advice. In Walt Disney Pictures' comedy, "I'll Be Home For Christmas."

Anyone who's ever tried to travel across the country during the Christmas holidays can sympathize with the plight of 18-year-old Jake Wilkinson. Who of us cannot recall our holiday joy at the memory of icy highways and snow-bound airports? Or of being gathered in some crowded terminal with hundreds of fellow travelers, all weary, anxious and short-tempered, listening to a harried attendant explain for the umpteenth time that our flight's been overbooked, and someone will have to be bumped? 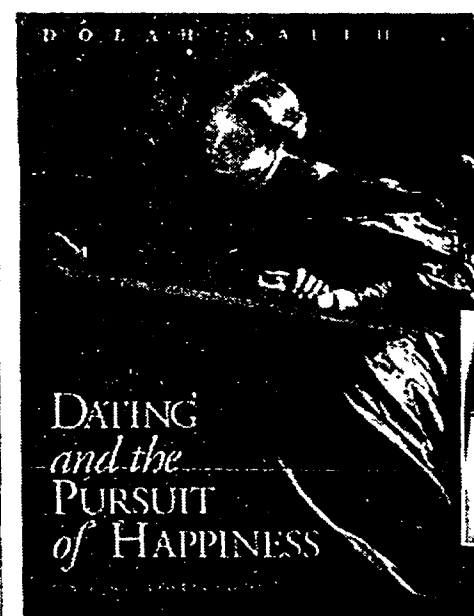

## Hockey team looks to repeat success of inaugural season

With the start of the 1998/99 Northville Mustang hockey season set to begin tomorrow night, coach Brad O'Neill is faced with an interesting dilemma.

The second-year coach believes he has a team that plays at a higher skill level than last year's district championship team. He has a nucleus of senior players returning, and two solid goaltenders to start the season.

So where's the dilemma?  
"Youth," O'Neill explained. "I feel as far as our skill level is concerned, we're deeper this year. The catch is that we're also younger."

The team will faceoff against the Novi Wildcats in the season opener tomorrow night at the new Novi Ice Arena. When the Mustangs take the ice they will boast a roster of 22 players - 11 who are freshman or sophomores.

The key for us as a team will be how the young guys take to high school hockey," O'Neill said. "We've been pretty impressed with what we've seen so far."

"Although we only have eight players returning from last year's squad, we did add some junior and senior players who didn't play last year," he added.

O'Neill will look to co-captains

Justin Waineo and Evan Edwards to provide leadership. Waineo was one of the top Mustang defenseman last year and O'Neill said the senior should have a great season.

"We knew that we were going to have to rely heavily on Justin's skill on the blue line," O'Neill explained. "He's hard to beat one on one and I think he's looking to improve his offense this year."

Edwards was a key element to last season's success, sharing the team lead in scoring with Kevin Boone. This year, according to O'Neill, Edwards' offensive output should continue.

"(Evan) found his niche in goal scoring last year," O'Neill said. "He's got a great shot, one of the hardest I've ever seen, and we're looking for him to provide plenty of offense this season."

"Both (Waineo and Edwards) will be strong leaders on the ice and in the room," O'Neill added.

The team's strength at the blue line improved with the addition of Chris Baldas, a senior transfer from Catholic Central. "Chris is a skilled player and at 5' 11" and 250 pounds, he'll be a real force defensively," O'Neill explained.

Also returning are defensemen Colin MacFarlane and Connor Sedam, who should provide solid minutes at the blue line. Senior

goaltender Don Strauch should see a majority of the minutes between the pipes, but O'Neill said newcomer Josh Block should see some time in net. "Josh is a good goaltender and we're glad to have him. Sometimes it's difficult to come up with two good goaltenders so we're fortunate to have Don and Josh," O'Neill said.

Despite a talent-laden lineup, O'Neill said that his team will have to work hard for every win this year. "It's not going to be easy, we're not going to sneak up on anyone like we did last year," he explained. "Our league has gotten better and better and we're going to face some extremely tough competition. It will be a challenge, but I think the kids are looking forward to that."

The Mustangs' first opponents are the Novi Wildcats, who are playing in their inaugural season. O'Neill said that despite the Wildcats' newness to the game, he's expecting a tough game.

"(Novi coach) Dan Phelps is a really good hockey coach and they've got some talent," he said. "Our team knows that this is a first year program but they know Novi has guys that have played hockey. We're looking for a really tough game, both ways."

The puck drops at 8 p.m. at the new Novi Ice Arena, located on Arena Drive, off of Novi Road.

## Cagers finish season strong

There's no better way to finish the regular season than the way the Northville basketball team did last week.

The Mustangs salvaged what they could from a post-season conference tournament that saw the team lose to eventual conference champion Walled Lake Central in the first round. The team defeated Livonia Churchill 38-32 last Thursday, just two days after defeating top-seeded Farmington Hills Harrison in the consolation semifinals.

The wins improved the Mustangs' record to 13-7 heading into the district tournament held this week at Plymouth Canton. Northville played Churchill/Canton last night in the semifinals (after The Northville Record's deadline) after receiving a bye in the first round. Results of all district action will be in next week's Record.

Against the Chargers, Northville came from behind to take control of the game after trailing 18-13 at the half. Kate Hammond scored six points and pulled down four rebounds during a 3:40 stretch near the end of the third quarter that saw her team pull to within a point at 26-25. Northville then outscored Churchill 13-6 in the fourth quarter to get the win.

"That sequence was really big," Northville coach Pete Wright said. "She really sparked us during that stretch. She wouldn't let us lose."

The Chargers created early-game problems for Northville by playing a box-and-one defense on Janel Hasse. This opened up the outside for the Mustangs' guards, who launched a season-high 10 three pointers.

"We had all the jumpers we wanted, but the shots weren't falling," Wright said. "Our feet were set, we just had a hard time

making anything in the first half."

Wright went to a three-guard set for the first time this season in the second half, a move that seemed to disturb Churchill's play in the backcourt. Alex Katona joined Kelly Anderson and Emily Carbutt in the backcourt.

"We were struggling, so we tried something different. Those three really put a lot of pressure on their guards."

Carbutt finished with 13 points, five steals and four assists and Hammond added eight points and five boards. Janel Hasse had five points and 11 rebounds and Meredith Hasse had six points and seven boards for Northville.

Avengeing a 41-37 loss just three weeks earlier, the Mustangs took advantage of a beat-up

Hawks squad.

Harrison was missing its starting guards Kelly Taylor and Cassie Jameson, who were out with injuries. But that didn't matter to Northville, which jumped out to a 10-4 lead and cruised to the win.

"They had people in different positions," the coach said. "We forced them to throw up a lot of three pointers, and we rebounded the ball well."

Six Mustangs had at least four rebounds, with Hammond and Janel Hasse leading the way with seven each. Hasse led all scorers with 14 points and Mary Tanski added eight.

"I thought Mary played a great game for us," Wright said. "She was on the receiving end of several breaks and did a nice job finishing for us."

As the quality of tennis continues to grow in metro-Detroit, every flight seems to get deeper and deeper. Thus, HomeTown has put together a collection of talent worthy of second-team honors.

### Kerry Woolfall Northville sophomore

# New club should only strengthen Northville

For years anyone interested in playing club tennis in the Northville and Novi areas had to travel to Farmington, West Bloomfield or Ann Arbor to satisfy their appetite.

But when the Novi Sports Club opened up this fall, a whole new window of opportunities popped up. Now girls and boys, men and women now have a place to play when Michigan's weather turns nasty, without traveling great distances to do so.

"We've already got all of our girls playing there," Northville coach Uta Filkin said. "Usually the kids take a break from tennis and concentrate on school or other activities, but it seemed like the girls started playing inside the day after states."

Northville and Novi players used to have to travel to North Farmington or Ann Arbor to play during Michigan's bad seasons. With the Sports Club, located just off Novi Road between Nine and Ten Mile roads, players from both communities as well as South Lyon, Milford and Lakeland High Schools can cut down on travel time.

Eventually the quality of tennis in the immediate area is going to rise, it's just a matter of how long from now.

At least for now, HomeTown's all-area squad still has a Northville/Novi flavor to it. But as the interest in tennis begins to peek its head into the surrounding South Lyon, Milford and Lakeland communities, it won't be long before those schools start catching up.

Just as the Mustangs and Wildcats have done.

Here's a look at HomeTown's first team, which reflects the great season turned in by both Northville and Novi, both state finalists.

### Sarah Pipas Novi senior

The Wildcat's No. 1 singles player had one of the most impressive seasons in team history, posting an incredible 21-5 record at the toughest flight in tennis.

She won the Kensington Valley Conference (KVC) championship, leading her team to its third-straight league crown, and finished as a regional finalist in the Division I regional at Livonia Stevenson.

As a captain, Pipas won her first match at the state meet before falling to the state semifinalist from West Bloomfield in the second.

"In terms of dedication and preparation, she's one of the best players we've ever had at this school," her coach said.

### Jessie Mills Northville junior

Aside from a few of her teammates in practice, little stood in the way of Mills this year on the hard court. The junior finished the season with a 23-3 record after winning both conference and regional championships.

After receiving a bye in the first round at the Division II state meet, she went on to win her second round match before bowing out in the quarterfinals. She's a repeat

first-team selection at second singles.

"I think she was greatly improved (from last year)," Filkin said. "She's getting more and more tournament experience and she's starting to find the resources she has within herself."

### Lauren West Northville freshman

West posted a 23-3 record in her first year on the varsity. She, along with fellow freshman Marta Walasek, took the area by storm by winning a regional championship and finishing runnerup at the Western Lakes conference tournament.

"I knew she was coming," her coach said. "She is an all-around player with no weaknesses. There's a lot of adaptation at the high school level and it's always a big step for a freshman to come in and play singles. She's really going to push Kerry (Woolfall) and Jessie (Mills) next year."

### Marta Walasek Northville freshman

The other half of the Mustang freshmen duo, Walasek thrived at the fourth singles flight. She finished 23-3 en route to conference and regional championships. She was seeded third at the state tournament and lived up to it, making it all the way to the state semifinals before losing to the eventual champion.

"Marta is just half a step behind Lauren in match experience," Filkin said. "Once she gets a little more match experience, she'll be a force."

### Julie Glock Northville senior Kara Anderson Northville senior

Although Filkin rarely lets her doubles teams play more than a year together, how could she say no to this pair? Anderson and Glock earned all-state honors a year ago and performed every bit as well in their senior season.

The two posted a 22-4 record while winning both the conference and regional titles. Glock and Anderson lost just three games total in each tournament.

At the state meet, the pair was seeded second and reached the semifinals before losing to Birmingham Marian 6-7 (3), 5-7.

"They've been so powerful and so good for two years now," Filkin said. "Julie has a big serve and great ground strokes and Kara is great at the net. They were a good combination. I'm going to have a big hole in my doubles lineup."

# Parents should set an example

*In an effort to get and keep my children active, I am considering some home gym equipment as a Christmas present. One of my children is 13 and the other 11. Is it OK for them to start weight training at this age? Do you have any other recommendations on how to get them away from the TV at least for a little while?*

I would like to commend you on accepting some of the responsibility for your children's physical activity and condition. Unfortunately, adolescent inactivity is a large problem and many parents leave that area solely to our schools. This is a critical mistake (as pointed out in the Surgeon General's report on physical activity and health), since only about 19 percent of all high school students report being physically active for 20 minutes or more in daily physical education classes. Only about one-half of young people (age 12-21) regularly participate in vigorous physical activity and participation in all physical activity declines strikingly as age or grade in school increases.

The number one thing parents can do in my opinion to start to resolve this problem is to consider setting something of an example themselves. I don't think it is a coincidence that adult physical participation is at a ridiculously low rate also. While the number of adults who exercised at least twice a week increased by 11 percent between 1995 and 1997, the number of nonparticipants increased nearly as much. While I am not a specialist in the area of child behavior, this example has to have an effect on our children. Coming home from work and going swimming together, playing basketball,

walking in a park or even in a mall, whatever it is, is a start versus fighting over the channel changer or computer. Our kids need to live out actual physical games instead of playing them all fantasy style on the electronic games.

Your idea of home equipment is a good one with a few concerns. According to the American Orthopedic Society for Sports Medicine (AOSSM), training can be safe for children if certain guidelines are followed and appropriate supervision is provided. Your young trainees require special attention to make sure that damage does not occur to his or her growth and development. Otherwise, if practiced properly, strength training does not have a negative effect upon growth, flexibility, cardiovascular or motor development. Some reports do indicate injuries with home training because some parents throw the equipment in the basement and let their kids go, maybe with a training book. This is not recommended. I do not know your background or availability, but maybe you and

your kids could make this a family affair a couple times a week. Some general AOSSM guidelines to follow are as follows:

- Never apply maximum efforts with the weights. This can result in serious tissue-related problems.
- The participant must have the emotional maturity to accept direction from a coach or personal trainer.
- Proper supervision is key. A personal trainer can be a valuable asset to start and maybe the parent can take it from there.
- Strength training should be a part of an overall conditioning program for fitness.
- Choose exercises that require minimum technique points, in other words, more simpler exercise.

- Frequency - two to three times per week.
  - Duration - 20 to 30 minutes per session.
  - Intensity - light weight to start, 5 or 10 pounds, 6-15 repetitions emphasizing proper form, working up to 1-3 sets total per exercise.
  - No maximal single repetition lifts, stick to the 6-15 recommended repetitions.
- Last word of caution, be careful of your equipment selection. As you are aware, the media represents all the latest super gadgets and that is a separate column. In short for children, stick to the basics, a good bench and some free weights are usually the place to start. Good luck.

## HOW TO

### Proper preparation leads to perfect painting projects

**Q.** We live in a 40-year-old brick ranch house in a development where there are some 1,500 others that are almost identical. Our window and door frames are painted over metal that rusts through the paint. Our neighbors all seem to have the same problem. Inquiries to professionals have been fruitless with most suggesting sanding to bare metal, re-priming and repainting. That would be an enormous, expensive project. Do you have any suggestions on a better solution?

**A.** Unfortunately, the pros are right. As with any painting project, proper preparation is essential, and there are no viable shortcuts. The durability of the new paint job will depend on this. Considering the age of the window installations, it might be preferable to have them replaced with a more modern, durable product. This would be a major expense. However, having a professional refurbish the existing frames will also be a major expense.

If you have the time and patience, it may be a task you can tackle yourself. Rusty surfaces should be wire brushed and/or scraped to remove loose rust, rust scale and loose or deteriorated previous paint. Often, it is best to remove every speck of paint - even paint that seems sound - because sometimes the metal underneath has already begun to rust.

Paint strippers can be used, but they are very messy and difficult to deal with. It may be best to use scrapers, a hammer and chisel and an old rasp to remove the loose stuff, then finish the job with a high-speed rotary sander of the kind used by auto refinishers. A wire brush accessory in a power drill is also an effective tool. Be sure to wear breathing and eye protection when using these type of tools.

A liquid rust remover is helpful if you have deep crevices or intricate levers and joints to attack. Apply with a brush, let set for 20 to 30 minutes, then spray off with a garden hose. Wipe everything clean with lacquer thinner.

You can eliminate some of this labor if you try one of the commercial rust converters. Typically, a converter contains tannic acid or a similar ingredient that combines with rust to form a black crystalline surface. This protects the metal underneath from further rust and can be painted without additional preparation. Most converters also contain either a latex compound or lacquer that adds another protective layer. Rust converters are readily available at most home centers, hardware stores or paint dealers. Before you apply a converter, you still must remove any flaking rust or loose paint by scraping with a wire brush or sandpaper.

Sound previous paint, which is hard or glossy, should be lightly sanded to assure maximum adhesion. Remove dirt, grease and oil by washing with a strong detergent solution or trisodium phosphate and water, and rinsing with fresh water. If there is a buildup of soil on the metal surface, wipe the surface with a cloth dipped in mineral spirits first. This will strip grease, oil, wax or other film from the surface. When the surface is thoroughly dry, apply two thin coats of converter. Follow manufacturer's instructions, as products vary somewhat. Converter is usually white or clear when applied, but becomes black when dry. When the converter is dry (products differ on recommended drying time) any oil- or alkylid-base paint may be applied.

When selecting paint, check with your paint dealer to be sure that it is compatible for the type of metal being coated. If you don't use a rust converter, you will need to apply two coats of primer prior to the finish topcoat. When a white or light color final finish is desired, it is best to use an intermediate coat of matte white to improve the hiding and appearance. Rust-Oleum markets a number of paints and primers developed specifically for durability and protection of metal surfaces. Your paint dealer can recommend other brands that are specifically suited to metals.

Whichever method you choose - scraping and sanding to bare metal or the use of a rust converter - don't try to clean all of the metal at once. Work on small sections or one window at a time. The minute you finish paint preparation on a section, apply either the rust converter or primer. Iron and steel start corroding almost the instant they are bare.

Be thorough in your application of primer or rust converter, so that the entire surface is covered and protected. Gaps or pin holes left uncovered will begin to corrode immediately.

Two thin coats always work better than one heavy coat to provide long-lasting protection. After you have completed your restoration project, be sure and inspect your window and door frames regularly, and keep them protected with touch-up paint as needed. This will prevent a recurrence of the problem you now face.

"When we moved here we wanted to find a piece of home... This reminded us of home," she said.

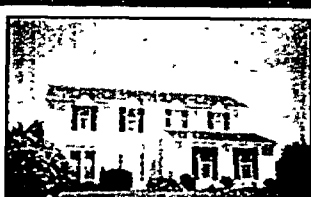

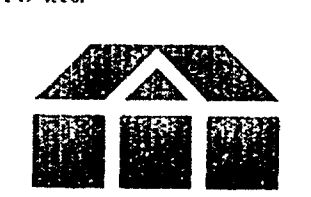

Darlene said they knew the outside needed help, but it wasn't until they moved in that they realized the interior had to be renovated. In fact, the inside had been renovated so many times over the years the couple wanted to restore it more to what it should look like as a Victorian farmhouse.

"We tried to put it back," she said.

Lucky for them, Darlene's father is an architect from Massachusetts. He helped them reconfigure the kitchen and create a master bedroom out of the old den and lean-to along-side it.

Many times, neighbors would stop by to see the progress or inquire about how they were going to change the home.

"People have been watching since we tore it apart and put it back together," Darlene said.

The register of deeds says the house is simply "old" but from records in the house and neighbors they've determined the original homestead was probably built in 1875 by the Bennett family, then in 1902 it was expanded to its large scale by the Nash's. One of the Nash cousins, Lloyd, still lives across the street.

It was built to reflect the wealth of the farm family, so expensive carpet covered beautiful hardwood floors and a wood stove heated the house. Fireplaces were for the average family, so none were installed in the house. The Goetz's had two installed when they renovated and also ripped out the carpet to expose the floors.

The walking history books who appear at the couple's door from time to time have shared stories of climbing down trellis in the middle of the night and funeral ceremonies in the front parlor. At one time, a family with six children, grandparents and a hired hand lived in the home, they've been told. Once, a woman stopped in with a painting done many years ago by her father of the farmhouse barn.

The house itself tells tales. While ripping off some of the wood outside, the couple discovered an old pistol hidden in the roof. And the signatures of William Nash and initials of other family members are engraved "all over the house."

On August 13, 1995 the couple decided it was time to tear down the old garden house. When they walked in ready to go to work and looked up at the ceiling, they couldn't believe the irony. Engraved in the plaster ceiling were the words "A hot and humid day, August 13, 1935."

"It gave us the creeps. It was bizarre," said Darlene. And glass marbles, the tell-tale sign of young children, can still be found buried in the yard.

Although they've completed many of the renovations themselves, the Goetz's have had quite a lot of help, too. Local handyman Norm "can do anything. He's been really helpful," according to Darlene.

And a Michigan State horticulture student used their yard as her final project, creating and planting flower gardens around the yard.

"I don't want everyone thinking we did this by ourselves," she said. "We had a lot of help."

# Arts and Crafts rocker followed Victorian Period

Q. I bought the oak rocking chair that is seen in this photo at a garage sale. I had to replace the upholstery on the seat, but the finish is still the original. There is no manufacturer mark anywhere on the rocker.

Can you tell me how much it is worth and how old it is?

A. You have a Mission Oak rocker. The style evolved out of the Arts and Crafts Period of furniture. Functional furniture with straight unadorned lines that characterize the Arts and Crafts movement was a reaction to the whiplash curves and excessively ornate Victorian designs. Your circa 1900 rocker would probably be worth about \$450 to \$550.

Q. This mark is on a service for eight set of ironstone dishes that I have. Each dish has burgundy-colored flowers in the center and burgundy trim on the border. What can you tell me about my dishes?



## ANTIQUES

A. G.L. Ashworth & Brothers in Hanley, Staffordshire, England used this mark. They have made ironstone and earthenware from 1784 to the present. Your dishes were made sometime between 1957 and 1964. The value of your set of dishes would probably be about \$400 to \$450.

Q. I would like some information about a kneehole desk that belonged to my mother. The center drawer runs the length of the desk and three drawers flank each side. The left side bottom two drawers are actually one drawer that contains an upright for files. On the bottom of one of the drawers is a stamped mark with a thunderbird inside a circle and the letters "H. Wa—d."

When was it made, by whom and what is its value?

A. Heywood Wakefield and Co. in Massachusetts made your desk between 1950 and 1965. Its value is probably \$350 to \$700.

Q. I have a one-quart Dazey butter churn with wood paddles that is in excellent condition. There is a metal crank that turns the wooden paddles. The words Dazey Churn & Mfg. Co. - St. Louis, U.S.A. are embossed on the jar.

What can you tell me about my churn?

A. Cream was processed into butter by a crank that turned the wood paddles. Dazey churns were available in a variety of sizes. Terri Clemens lists a similar churn in

"American Family Farm Antiques" at \$1025.

Q. A friend of my mother gave me a ceramic humidor in the shape of a black man's head. He is wearing a red and yellow cap with a white bill and a green bow tie. The only marking is the number "27" on the bottom. Can you estimate the value?

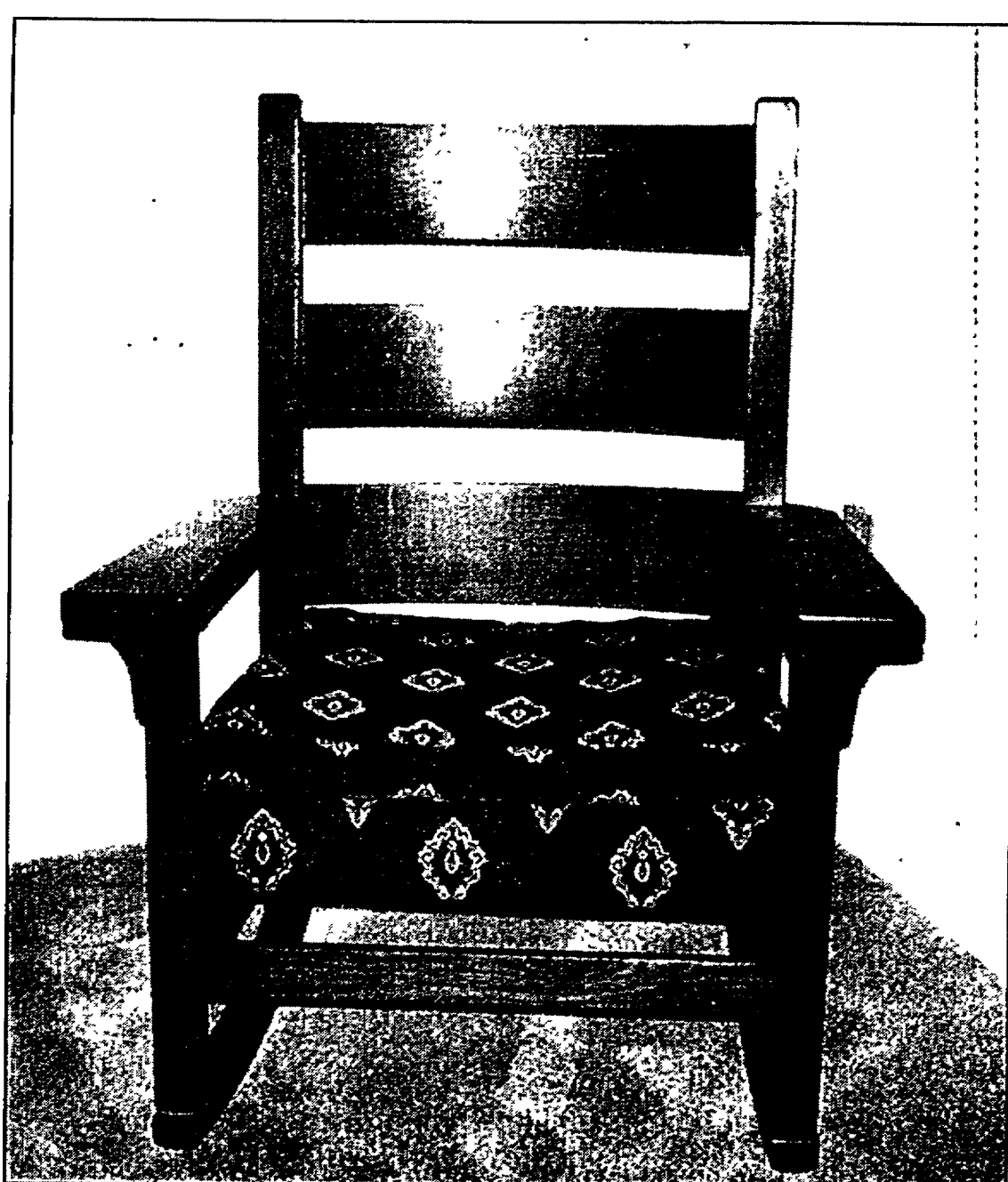
A. Your humidor was made in the early 1900s. It is an example of Black Americana. It has a crossover value, having appeal to collectors of Black Americana and to bacclana. The number is a mold/design number. Its value would probably be about \$500.
