Raging motorists

Keller has tips to help keep drive-time anger in check

You've seen them. Heck, you may even be one of them. You know who we're talking about — the drivers who just plain lose it when they get caught in a traffic jam and take it out on everyone else later on.

The term "road rage" has been coined by psychologists and mental health specialists for that condition that overtakes people when they're in those less-than-ideal driving

situations. Not coincidentally, Northville counselor Arnold Keller said he's seen an upswing in the number of cases of persons seeking help for the condition this summer.

"This makes sense when you factor in the increased population in the area and the lack of a mass-transit system around here," he said.

Keller said there are two major groups of roadragers. The first, he said, is comprised of persons with severe prob-

lematic symptoms. Those persons generally have other anger issues to work out in other arenas, such as home or work, he said, and also tend to be people with very few constructive relationships.

These, he said, are the seldom-experienced

Allegation letter can't be found prosecutor says

■ Padzieski claims he may have misspoken when he said a letter would be required for investigation to take place.

A spokesman for the Wayne County Prosecutor's office confirmed a letter that started a four-month investigation of a Northville man does not exist in the office or has been lost.

That revelation has prompted Wayne County commissioner Lyn Bankes to begin looking into the matter. Bankes said she is launching her own investigation but wasn't ready to comment publicly

about it this week.

Meanwhile, Michigan State Police said their own investigation into Northville businessman Jim Nield should be completed within a "few weeks."

Both investigations could determine whether or not the allegation letter exists and, if so, who allegedly witnessed any wrongdoing by Nield.

Ray Padzieski, chief of operations for the Wayne County Prosecutor's office, said he may have misspoken when he told *The Northville Record* a letter would be required for such an investigation to take place.

"That's what we generally do," he said. "I may have misspoken

Student expelled for making threat in school bathroom

■ Second student receives warning for part in June incident at high school.

Northville school board members expelled one student and opted not to expel another after a threatening message was seen on a girls' bathroom wall in May.

The board unanimously voted Thursday to expel one girl, but unanimously voted not to expel another, both of whom were lead suspects in the incident. Though their identities were made public at the meeting, the names of the girls are being withheld by the *Record*.

Both girls were investigated by school authorities after a tip was received connecting them to the incident, which happened only days after the school shooting in Littleton, Colo.

Board president Tom Gudritz, secretary, Joan Wadsworth, Richard Brown, Jr., treasurer Mike Poterala and trustee Martha Nield were present for the vote.

A synopsis of the investigation, provided in school board members' meeting packets, suggested that the girl who was ultimately expelled gave conflicting information as to who drew a swastika and the accompanying message.

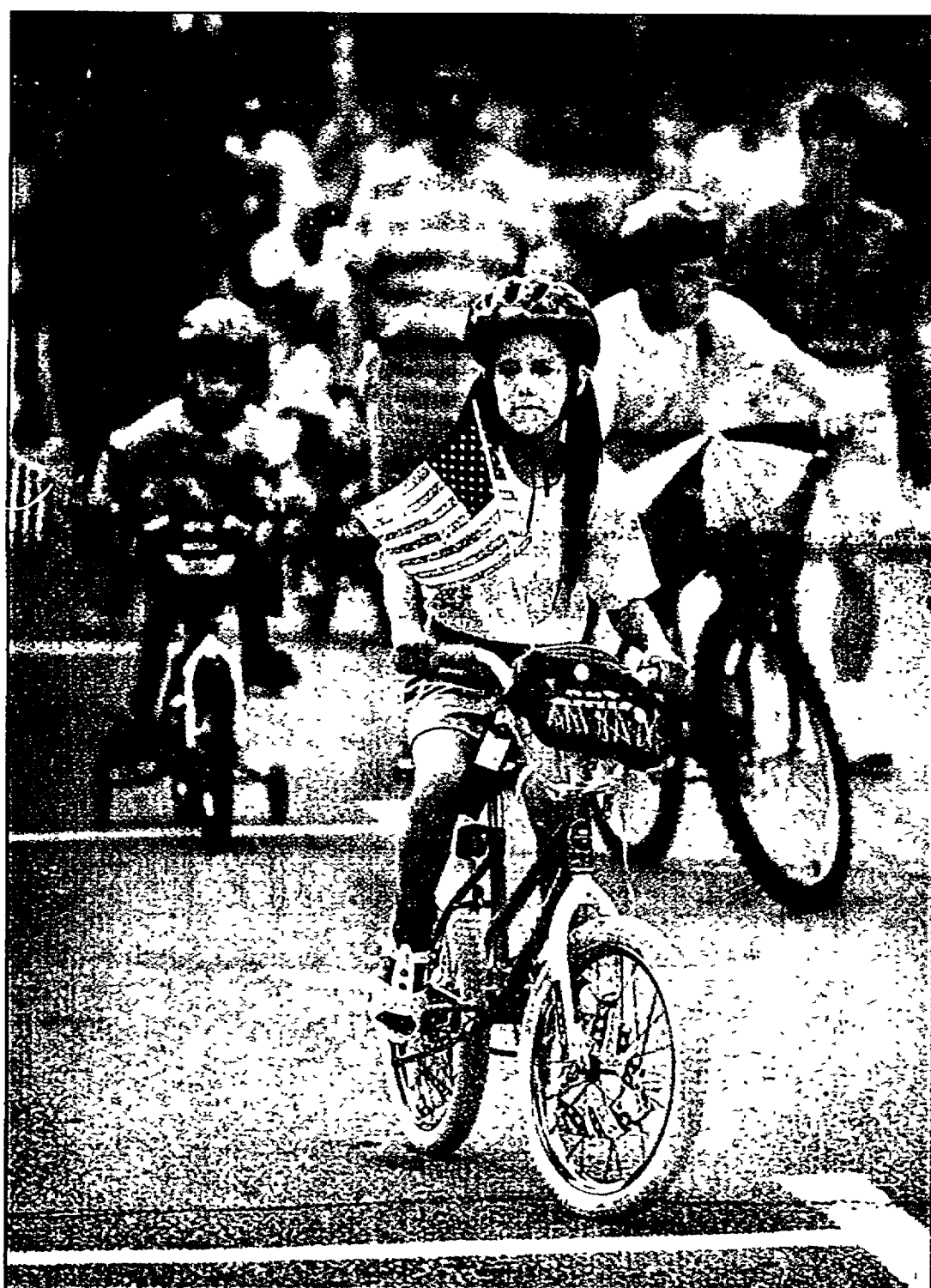

City to replace Main St. clock

Don't worry, Northville's downtown landmark clock hasn't been permanently replaced with a milk crate.

The clock, like two other Northville landmarks, is in the process of being refortified after years of abuse from nature and, in the case of the clock, a car driving into it.

The other two landmarks in a state of repair are the waterwheel and the gazebo around the well on South Main Street.

Gary Word, Northville city manager, said he wants the new clock installed within three months.

"The clock is a Northville icon," he said. "It's an identifying characteristic of the community that's to remain indefinitely."

The clock was damaged May 18 when a 55-year-old Livonia woman traveling eastbound on Main Street drove into the clock. She was driving about 40 mph when she drove over the curb, over a rock and into the clock. She told police she was lost.

In addition to her being lost, though, so was some of the functionality of the clock along with brickwork and landscaping around the base.

The casing of the clock will be entirely replaced with some of the salvageable mechanisms reused, Word said.

"It's interesting the price to replace the clock has not gone up much since it was first installed 18 years ago," Word said.

The cost is \$18,000, he said. But with shipping and handling and the brickwork replacement the project cost will be between \$25,000 and \$26,000, Word said. The insurance company of the woman is paying for the project.

Another less costly project, yet also an important Northville landmark, is the replacement of the

Prosecutor's office says letter can't be found

when I said it happens like that every time."

The alleged letter started a four-month investigation in March of Northville businessman Jim Nield. The investigation is to determine if Nield used school district equipment and labor to help promote a March rally to put pressure on the Northville board of trustees to settle its litigation against the Northville School district.

Ray Walsh, deputy Wayne County Prosecutor and former Northville School Board candidate, said in early June he received a letter from a citizen who had concerns about the possible misuse of school resources. He has since refused to comment and wouldn't return telephone calls.

Walsh said he passed the letter onto Northville Police Chief Jim Petres who said he passed it on to state police to avoid the appearance of impropriety toward either side.

Petres said he couldn't recall seeing the original letter complaint. Neither could State Police detective Tim Heideman, who initially took the case.

State police Detective Donald Raymond said he couldn't confirm or deny a letter existed until his investigation on the case is

completed. The investigation, he said, should be "completed and passed on to the (Wayne County) Prosecutor's office within a few weeks."

Even with Petres or the prosecutor's office inability to produce a letter and the state police department's inability to release whether or not a letter exists, Padzieski said he thinks the investigation must have some merit.

"If there's nothing to be investigated why are state police wasting their time on it?" Padzieski said.

Walsh, who could not be reached for comment this week, works in the same county department as Karen Woodside, Northville Township supervisor.

Woodside and several township trustees faced the threat of recall earlier this year. The citizen's action group Families for a Better Northville threatened to initiate recall proceedings if Woodside and the board refused to drop a lawsuit against Northville Public schools over the construction of the new Northville High School. It's not known whether Woodside is connected in any way to the investigation. She did not return numerous telephone calls from The Northville Record this week.

Student expelled for threatening message

"You will pay," in the restroom. A date was also listed near the writing.

When it was discovered, school officials reacted to the writing by having police officers in and around the building on the date specified in the writing.

The synopsis indicated the expelled girl first told high school assistant principal David Maile that she was joined by the second girl in the bathroom stall when the writing was done, and that it was the second girl who wrote the message. The expelled student later told Northville detective sergeant Dave Fendele that she, not the second girl, had done the writing in the stall.

The contradiction in stories was just one of the reasons cited for the decision, in addition to the widespread concern generated by the writing.

The second girl was spared expulsion, school board member Martha Nield said, because the evidence presented before the board was not conclusive enough to warrant such permanent action

to be taken. She and her mother made an appeal before the school board June 23. Nield was not present for the hearing, but said that based on conversations had with other members, she had learned that the evidence against the second girl was not sufficient to meet the grounds for expulsion.

Nield said the expelled girl's plan to enter the restroom and write the message in the stall. But despite being allowed to return to classes in the fall, Nield said the non-expelled student would be watched closely by school personnel.

At the expulsion appeal hearing, school attorney Richard Fanning argued that even if the second girl didn't do the actual writing on the bathroom stall, her presence and awareness of actions taking place warranted the expulsion.

Information presented to the school board following the investigation of the second girl indicated that the second girl also acknowledged her use of marijuana and bringing cigarettes to school.

The synopsis indicated that police who interviewed the second girl were told by her that she

believed the swastika to be a symbol of Judaism, which indicated to school officials that the girl "did not understand the historical significance of a swastika."

In the, Nield said the expelled student had several options open to her, but coming back to Northville schools was not one of them.

Among the other educational opportunities the girl could embark upon: home schooling, pursuing her graduate equivalency degree once she turned 16 or enrolling in an open district that accepted cross-community students with circumstances such as her own.

A cover letter to the expelled student's mother from district business and finance director John Street said that the girl's infraction of school rules and state law demanded "severe punitive action by the school district."

Poterala said Thursday's expulsion vote was the first he had encountered since being elected to the board.

"It's an unfortunate duty we have," he said. "You always want

to be supportive of kids, but you need to balance that desire with keeping the security of the students and staff at the buildings."

Poterala said administrators both at Northville High and across the district acted appropriately, given the national psyche of the moment. He said it was difficult, if not impossible, to say if the board's decision would have been different had the Littleton massacre never occurred.

"You don't know what the mood would have been," he said. "I would hope that if similar situations like this happened in the future that the district would do the same thing. If I'm going to err, I'd rather err on the side of caution."

Poterala also chimed in suggestions heard around the country back in April and early May that schools close early to avoid having to deal with additional threats of violence.

"If we had done that, we would have encouraged them," he said, adding that closing schools would have played right into the hands of the would-be assailants.

Teens arrested for underage drinking

Five Northville teens were arrested for underage consumption of alcohol after drawing attention to themselves by yelling obscenities at Northville Police officers.

The incident happened June 25 at about 5 p.m.

According to a Northville Police report, police officers were handling a regular traffic stop when five teens packed in a Honda drove by and yelled obscenities at them.

Police chased the car and pulled it over. Inside were five teens who told police they hadn't been drinking despite the overwhelming presence of an alcohol odor.

They were given preliminary breath tests with the following results: an 18-year-old girl who lives on Dunlap and is a Safety Town assistant blew a .024; a 16-year-old brother blew a .024; a 19-year-old who lives on Waterfall blew a .031 the 18-year-old driver who lives on Waterfall blew a .149; a 16-year-old who lives on Rogers blew a .061.

All received underage consumption tickets and the driver received a transport of alcohol violation.

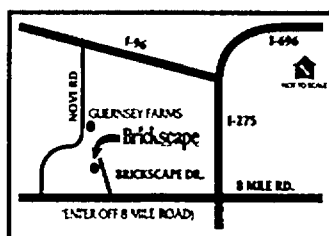

Business cited in tobacco sting

Only one local business out of six that sell cigarettes in the city failed a tobacco sting conducted by Northville Police.

Hamlet Food Mart, 1051 Novi Road, Northville, sold one pack of Marlboro Light cigarettes to a 17-year-old June 18.

According to a Northville Police report, the 17-year-old girl decoy walked into Hamlet and attempted to buy the cigarettes. The man behind the counter, Faraj Tomina, did ask for identification, the report said, but sold to the girl anyway.

Tomina said he misread the identification presented to him and thought the "2" in 1982 looked like a one.

"I did my job," he said. "I just didn't finish it."

Tomina said the business always asks for identification when selling alcohol and or cigarettes and that he was caught making a "simple mistake" of misreading an identification presented to him.

Jim Petres, chief of Northville Police, said his department usually tries to conduct two tobacco decoy tests during the year.

During the sting an underage decoy is sent into a business and attempts to buy cigarettes. The decoy doesn't present identification unless asked.

At Arbor Drugs, Clark gas station, Good Time Party Store, Mobil and Northville Gourmet, the decoy was refused the sale of tobacco.

Enforcement of the tobacco law is done at the local level, which means Hamlet will be punished through the court system, Petres said.

"They'll be put through the normal court process," Petres said.

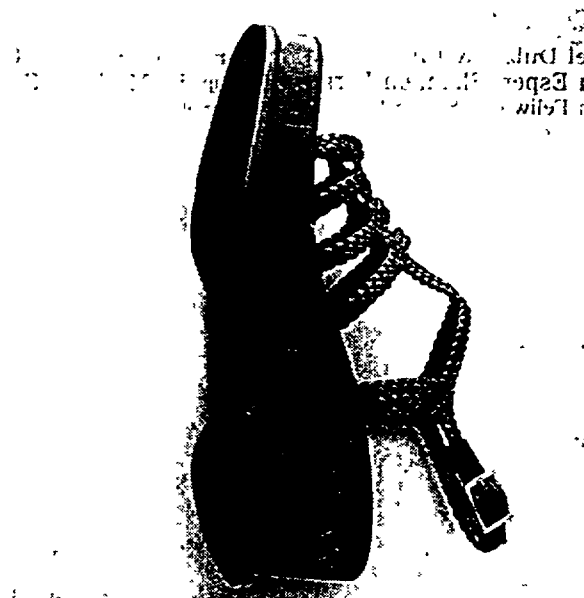

Saying goodbye

Morhous, Najarian set to leave principal posts

Cardboard boxes were being loaded with photographs and coffee mugs Thursday, as two more administrators in the Northville school district prepared to move on.

Winchester Elementary School principal Kathy Morhous and Thornton Creek Elementary School principal Mary Najarian both reflected on their experiences in the district, saying their departures were bittersweet.

Morhous, a resident of the Ann Arbor/Dexter area for several years, said she was taking a new position in the Ann Arbor school district to be closer to home. She has been principal at Winchester for each of the 13 years she's been in the Northville district.

Morhous came to Northville from the Hartland school district, where she was also a school administrator.

"There are really two things I think about when I think of Winchester," Morhous said. "I remember that I came from a district (Hartland) that only had a small number of special classes, like art, music and gym. To come here and hear kids singing in the hallways was just wild."

Morhous said she thought highly of parental involvement at

Winchester, and recalled the large turnout of parents at the school's PTA meetings.

And, of course, there were her memories of the staff.

"It's hard to say goodbye," she said. "My staff was outstanding. The Northville system is a credit to that. The teachers have been wonderful to work with."

Najarian's departure was a genuine retirement, she said. She said she has spent her entire professional career in the Northville district, though not exclusively in administration.

"I was a raw rookie when I was hired in 1970," Najarian said. She started out as a gym teacher at Amerman and Moraine Elementary. She eventually moved her way into the classrooms at Amerman and Winchester, and spent some time working in the district's gifted student program.

Najarian broke into administration when Moraine, which had been closed down for several years, was reopened in 1989. She got the building back up and running before spending her final years in the district at Thornton Creek.

Experience notwithstanding, Najarian said her fondest memories were of the students in the buildings she worked at.

"You can never be down in the dumps when you're around kids," she said. "They keep you laughing. You can come into the building being sad about something at home, but five minutes after being there they have you smiling again."

Najarian said she would remain in the Northville area for now, but planned on doing some traveling. She said she'd also "fallen in love" with The Stampeddler in downtown Northville and would be frequenting the store in the near future.

As she was loading items into cartons, Najarian said the photographs of events in years' past were bringing back a flood of memories. She referred to a Record photograph of a pig trying to eat her lunch.

"That one really put a smile on my face," she said.

Najarian's last official day at the school is June 30.

In addition to Morhous and Najarian, Old Village School administrator Christine Clinton-Call has also announced her departure. School board members approved the hiring of Bentley Elementary School principal Cheryl Johnson to take over for Najarian. Replacements for Morhous and Clinton-Call are still being sought.

Runners will see new course at Roadrunner Classic

Those who like to hose down runners in Northville's annual RoadRunner Classic had better get longer hoses.

A change to the route of the July 31 race takes the runners away from the downtown Northville area and into Hines Park for the meat of the race.

"We really felt it was time to go back to making the RoadRunner Classic a more simplified race,"

said Belinda Lee, race director.

More than 1,200 people are expected to participate in the event, Lee said.

The new race route shows off the city and country aspects of Northville, she said.

Additionally, she said the changes will be better for runners' bodies because of less turns.

"It'll just be less stressful for the runners overall," she said.

But the change has left some

runners steamed.

"One of the major drawing points of the race has been running through the streets downtown and through the neighborhoods," said Jerry Mittman, Northville resident. "It's fun for the crowds to be out there cheering and cooling the runners off with sprinklers and hoses. It's a real community event."

Here is the path of this year's course: start near the bandshell

downtown on Main Street and go west to Center Street; south on Center to Hines Drive; then southeast on Hines to a point north of Five Mile Road; north to Seven Mile; when nearing the Northville Athletic Field they follow the bike path to the end at Seven Mile Road and River; up River Street to the entrance of the Northville Downs parking lot.

In previous years, the race snaked its way through downtown Northville streets.

Mittman is a former Northville city council member who was on the board when representatives from the RoadRunner Classic wanted to move the race from Livonia to Northville in 1993. The race itself started in 1984 and was organized by running-club the Redford RoadRunners.

One of the main reasons the race was approved for Northville was the high-level of community involvement the race promised, he said.

Mittman said the RoadRunner Classic may "still be a top event" but said he'll miss the community aspect of it.

Marc Cryderman, Northville resident and former city council member, told the Northville City Council the race "has lost all of its appeal."

"We spent five years planning the race so everybody would be happy," he said. "Now it's just going to be a Hines Park run."

Alleged child abductor still sought

■ Northville, Novi police warn residents to be on lookout for man in red Chevy truck.

City of Northville and Northville Township police are warning parents to be on the lookout for anything suspicious as area departments look for a possible child abductor.

Numerous tips have come in since the suspect and his truck description started to appear on TV and in newspapers late last week. None of them have led to the

male yet though.

"We've probably received a couple of dozen tips," said Northville Police Detective Dave Fendelet. "But we're still looking for any information that could help."

Novi Police Detective Tod Anger said his department has received several lead on the man as well. None have led to the suspect yet.

The male has been described as between 30 and 50 years old with blonde, sandy brown to light brown or possibly gray hair and "not heavy, but a little overweight."

The vehicle the suspect is driving is an older model Chevy S-10 pickup truck that's red and possibly faded. A key identifying fac-

tor of the truck is the driver's side front fender that is a different color, possibly dark blue or black.

The male driver tried to entice six girls to his car June 20 in the Novi and Northville area. The man reportedly resurfaced in Wixom last Wednesday near 12 Mile Road and Napier.

Detectives from Northville and Novi have met with other area departments to alert them to the situation.

Northville Township Detective Paul Sumner said after he met with Fendelet all township officers were briefed on the suspect and his vehicle including a handout with the male's picture.

He said the department has

received a number of complaints about a man and truck fitting the description, including a possibly sighting in the Woods of Edenderry subdivision, but nothing has turned out to be solid.

That doesn't mean to stop calling the police if something looks suspicious, he said.

"The biggest thing parents can do is brief their children about what to do if something happens," Sumner said. "If residents suspect something has happened they need to contact the police at the occurrence and not wait."

Keller: keep anger in check

but nonetheless notorious cases where drivers may stab or shoot one another.

"They tend to be competitive people who want to 'beat' other drivers," he said. "They believe that other people who do things wrong ought to be punished. They have very punitive personalities."

Though such people are more dangerous to be around, they're fewer in number than the other kind of roadrager Keller mentioned: persons with a Type-A personality disorder.

"With these people, there's an ongoing sense of urgency about things," he said. "They feel as if they always have to be somewhere soon."

Keller gave the example of such a person driving from Six to Eight Mile roads. Under normal circumstances, the trip might take five minutes to complete. If a traffic backup or detour caused the commute to take any longer than the prescribed time, the driver would likely become excessively agitated, he said.

Keller said drivers with this kind of complex tended to drive faster than other people and had much lower frustration tolerance levels than other people.

"They become angry when roadblocks stand in the way of where they want to be," Keller said.

The treatment for drivers who have such characteristics is to establish a new belief system, Keller said.

"What we teach people is to say 'It's not awful I don't quite get there on time,'" he said, adding that encouraging people to budget their time such that an allotment for unexpected circumstances isn't

STAYING CALM...ON THE ROAD

So you say you're a calm driver who's been hassled by other nuts out on the road? Here's what Keller suggests you do if someone else is pestering you out on the road.

- Keep your eyes straight ahead and ignore the perpetrator. Keller said this is a particularly effective maneuver if someone is yelling at you from afar. Don't make eye contact, don't begin altering your driving pattern and don't speak to the other person. Just go about your business as usual. In most circumstances, Keller said, not being able to engage in a confrontation with another driver is all that's necessary to get someone off your back.

- If someone is getting seriously hostile, or has approached your car window demanding to speak with you as to why you did something the way you did, acknowledge making a mistake, even if you didn't. Saying something like "I'm sorry — I don't know what I was thinking" can cool off the situation.

- If all else fails and someone becomes extremely verbally or physically hostile, don't be afraid to call the police. Be prepared to give your name and approximate location to the dispatcher, as well as a description of the perpetrator, description of the car he or she was driving and the license plate number, if known.

a half-bad idea, either. "Any time that you can anticipate encountering frustration ahead of time, you raise your tolerance level for it."

Most importantly, though, Keller said the trick from a psychological perspective is in learning the difference between what's acceptable and what isn't while you're behind the wheel. Keller said the feeling of isolation and anonymity experienced while driving gives drivers a sense of invulnerability and control over a situation. When situations occur that disrupt that state of being, roadragers react in inappropriate ways.

"This is a matter of learning emotional propriety," Keller said. "We get people to go from anger and rage to annoyance and disturbance. Those are more appropriate and acceptable emotions to have."

For example, Keller said drivers who find themselves in a construction zone behind a line of other cars may experience intense periods of anger. The properly treated driver, he said, won't view the tieup with such a bitter outlook.

Instead, it's an inconvenience, but an opportunity to listen to a favorite song on the radio or make a call to a business associate on a cell phone.

One effective technique Keller said he recommended to patients dealing with road rage was a combination of relaxation breathing and visualization of a peaceful setting. The treatment, he said, was effective, but needed to be practiced at home before a person would get back out on the road.

In addition, Keller said he encouraged people to reduce their stress levels, exercise, watch their nutrition and to improve their relationships to help reduce the stress on the roads.

Keller said a few of the cases he has handled for treatment have been court-appointed. He also said road rage has not been recognized by the psychological community as a separate mental condition in and of itself. Rather, he said, it's a symptom that other anger issues may be present in a person's life.

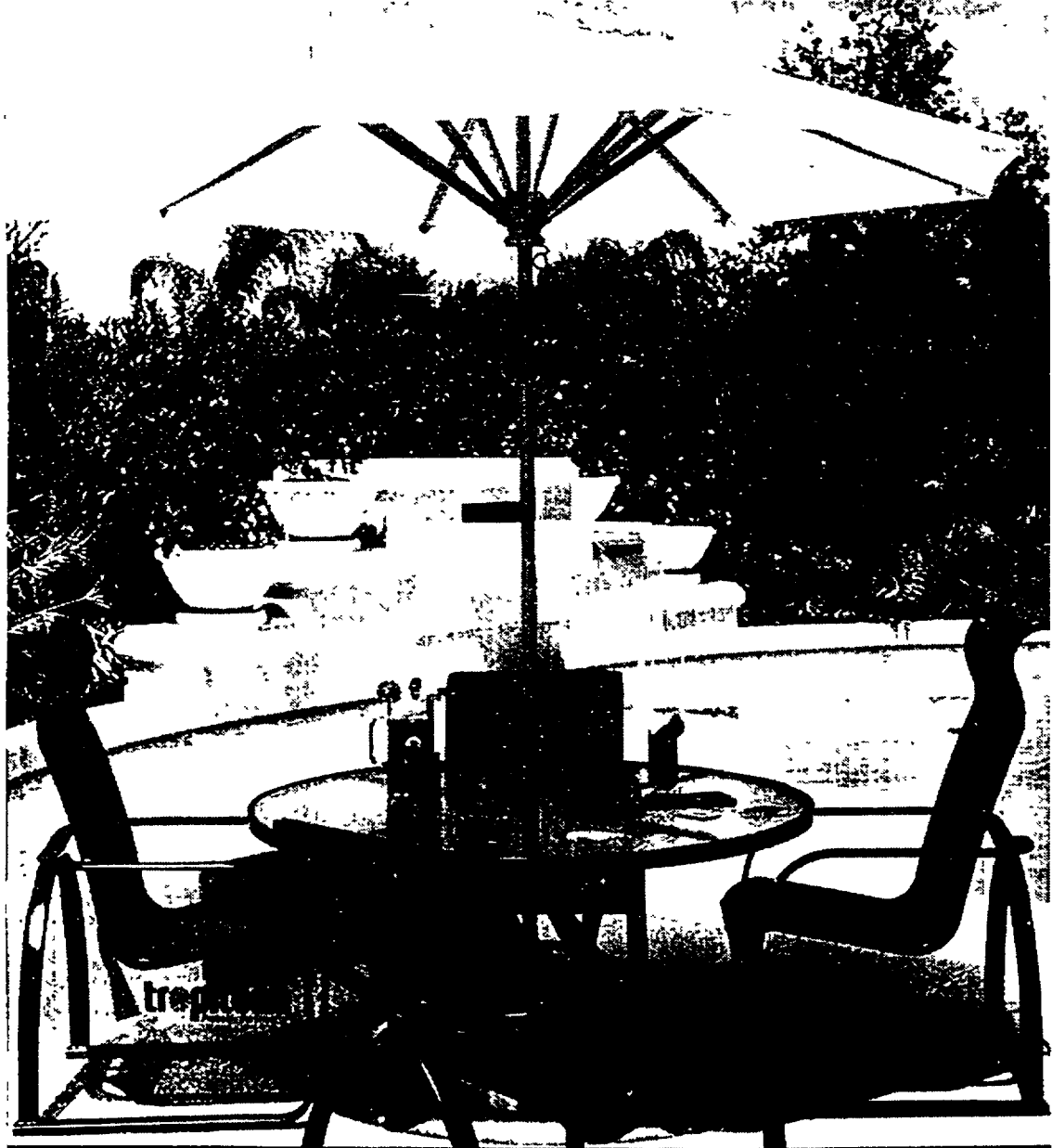

shelter around the city's infamous well.

Mel Newdigger, president of the Northville Rotary Club, said the project will cost slightly more than \$5,000. It's being paid for by an endowment left just for the well.

"We thought the old shed did not give the true image Northville should have," he said. "It was a very old shell."

The previous shelter was constructed of split railroad ties, Newdigger said. The new gazebo is

made of cedar.

Newdigger said he'd hoped to have the gazebo up in early spring, but the project ran into delays with weather, finding workers to help and other unexpected obstacles.

For example, some older pipe was discovered less than a foot underground that kept the foundations from being laid.

"I thought we would come out here one Saturday and take down the old shelter and the next Saturday we would put the new one up," he said. "That didn't happen."

The older pipe was removed and

the gazebo was installed June 26.

Progress also is being made on Northville's waterwheel.

Rick Cox, owner of the Waterwheel building, said the wheel is "very close" to becoming fully-operational.

"The wheel's been lifted, the bearing blocks have been removed and we've removed the bearing inserts," he said.

The holdup is with a problem trying to reproduce the bearings, Cox said.

Getting the wheel to this point involved using four 10-ton jacks to lift the wheel into operational posi-

tion, he said. Additionally, the gates in the bottom of the wheel and near the tower have been replaced.

The total cost of the project has been more than \$10,000, Cox said.

Cox said the wheel won't be painted because "once it gets running it'll look like it always has."

The wheel will begin turning as soon as the bearings are fixed and installed.

"We'd hoped to have it running by this weekend but I don't that will happen," Cox said.

Lawmakers mull bill to cut down lawsuits

Think long and hard before filing that lawsuit. Under legislation pending in Lansing, the "loser" in a legal case would be required to pick up the attorney fees for the prevailing side.

Proponents argue the bill would cut down on frivolous lawsuits.

As examples of such cases, proponents cite a legal action brought against a Hartland Township truck stop. A customer spilled coffee on herself and filed the case in court looking to recover damages. Although the truck stop owners were eventually cleared of any negligence, the case carried considerable legal costs for the business, according to the Michigan Lawsuit Abuse Watch, a Southfield-based advocacy group.

Other examples cited include a suit brought against a beer maker for false advertising. A drinker filed because the beer, despite "implicit promises made in advertisements," did not bring him success with women.

The University of Michigan was sued by a student who received an F in German. The state has been sued when a visitor allegedly caught a cold in the drafty rotunda of the Capitol building.

Senate Bill 119, sponsored by Senator Glenn Stell, R-Grand Rapids, would require the loser in lawsuits to pay attorneys fees for the winner in order to discourage such suits. The proposal would require the loser to pay the winner's attorney fees if the winner prevails on all counts in the case. Absent an outright win, the judge would have discretion as to which party would

pay the legal bills of the other. Judges could limit costs if they believed the amount was unfair.

Businesses are largely in favor of the legislation.

"The sad and unfair aspect of this abuse is that the system is weighted in favor of the one who sues, at the expense of the one who has to defend. You can go broke in America proving that you are right," said Charles Owens, Director of Michigan's branch of the National Federal of Independent Business.

Opponents include trial lawyers who contend the judicial system already has protections against frivolous cases. Currently, judges may award attorney fees as part of the judgment, but they are not required to.

"We may have a loser pays system

in theory, but not in practice," Owens said. "This is due to an unwillingness on the part of most judges to discipline their peers when they bring forth a frivolous lawsuit and because the definition of what constitutes a frivolous lawsuit is weak."

Opponents however argue that not all cases that lose are necessarily frivolous. A loser pays system, they believe, would discourage cases which have merit from being filed if the plaintiff could not afford the defendant's fees should the case fail to win.

The bill has been sent to the senate's judiciary committee for review. Action on the proposal is expected to come up in the fall.

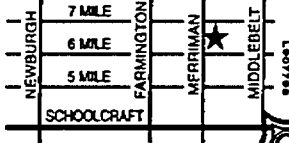

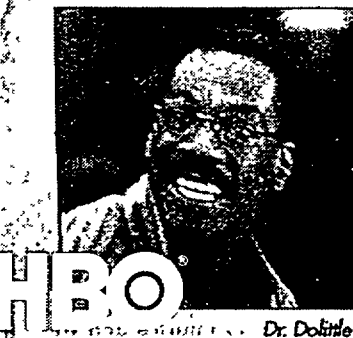

School board was right in punishment to student

If it had happened at any other time, the May discovery of a swastika, a date and the phrase "You will pay" on a Northville High School bathroom stall would have probably been just another tasteless but innocuous teenage scribbling.

But given the fact that more than a dozen youths had been gunned down only weeks earlier in Littleton, Northville administrators had no choice but to rally the troops and find out who wrote the ominous message.

Find out they did, and on Wednesday, the responsible student learned her fate: she will no longer be welcome in the Northville school district.

Not now. Not tomorrow. Not next fall. Not ever again.

Was it a fair punishment? In our opinion, absolutely so.

It would have been easier in this, the era of political correctness, to opt not to come down hard on the girl, brushing it aside as a "youthful indiscretion" or another example of "kids just being kids." Hardcore bleedinghearts might say what the school board did violated the young woman's freedom of speech.

How wrong can you get? For a moment, we'll ignore the fact that the girl's actions defaced school property — an act, might we add, punishable by expulsion — and focus on what was written.

A swastika. A date. The words, "You will pay."

In our opinion, this isn't quite the same as the opening line to a "What I Did Over My Summer Vacation" essay. In this case, these words and symbols carry evil over-

tones. And given the state of mind pervasive across Northville, the state of Michigan and the entire nation at the time it was discovered, these writings were just downright sinister.

No, what this young woman did wasn't careless behavior. It was calculated and mean-spirited, made worse with Columbine and copycat incidents that followed. School administrators had every right to do what they did. In fact, we'd be hounding the district if such action wasn't taken.

For the record, expulsion was waived for the other suspect in the incident because the evidence against her wasn't solid enough. Again, a round of applause to the board for this decision. Expulsion is akin to academic deportation

and therefore shouldn't be handed out like detention. It is, and ought to be, reserved for those extreme cases where the health and well-being of the students and faculty comes into question.

That's not to say that the second girl's involvement should go unpunished. We

encourage special provisions be put in place such that the second girl not be allowed to wander the hallways of Northville High unsupervised, since she demonstrated lack of trustworthiness in doing so. Perhaps monitored cleaning of bathrooms for a semester might also be an appropriate action to take.

Thankfully, no one suffered physical harm from the incident. Emotional tolls are another story.

We can only hope that the warm summer weather and time away from schools will help put the ugliness of April/May 1999 in the rear view mirror.

Don't forget to thank volunteers for parade

Saturday morning will be a time to salute America, its veterans, its forefathers and its leaders.

While we're at it, we think it's a perfect time to salute those who helped save Northville's Independence Day parade this year, as well as those who worked double-time to make the event live to see another brilliant summer day.

When the word came down back in April that the event — nearly 150 years old — was in jeopardy of not happening for lack of organizational backing, community members came out of the woodwork and rushed to the aid of the Northville Township Foundation. That sort of dedication isn't found in just any municipality, and we think it merits a recognition on our part and by the 40,000 people expected to jam Main Street this weekend.

While we confess that we weren't don't know for certain if there were

dozens of organizational meetings held, nor if there were hundreds of phone calls made, stacks of paperwork sorted and nights of sleep cut short, we're not so naive as to think a parade like Northville's just "happens."

It doesn't. Not by a longshot.

It takes place only when some dedicated volunteers (hopefully some of them reading right now) take the time from their busy schedules and give back to their city. It speaks to the character of residents with whom we're blessed to have.

So as you admire the floats, clap to the beat of the bands, delight as the clowns stride down the street and take in all that's red, white, and blue this weekend, remember that it was a volunteer spirit that forged America.

It's also a volunteer spirit that has allowed us to continue celebrating America.

Investigation poses troubling questions

I've got a pertinent question to ask this week, and it seems I'm not going to get the answer from the Wayne County Prosecutor's office.

Why, exactly, are we expending taxdollars to investigate Jim Nield?

I pose this question because we learned a startling, if not troubling, revelation regarding the four-month-long investigation into allegations that Nield used school district equipment and labor to help promote a March rally to put pressure on the Northville board of trustees to settle its litigation against the Northville School district.

The investigation came about when deputy Wayne County Prosecutor Ray Walsh — you remember him, he recently made an unsuccessful bid to be elected to the school board — allegedly received a letter from a private citizen claiming Nield had misused district equipment and labor in an effort to recall Northville Township supervisor Karen Woodside, herself an assistant Wayne County prosecutor.

Walsh claimed he passed the letter on to local police officials, and an investigation began.

Problem is, according to Ray Padzieski, chief of operations for the prosecutor's office, the letter doesn't exist in his office. This revelation comes weeks after Padzieski, along with Wayne County Prosecutor John O'Hair, told the *Record* that a letter would be required to launch such an investigation, and that the prosecutor's office would certainly keep copies of such letters on file.

This week, however, Padzieski said his earlier comments may have been in error. "That's what we generally do," he told reporter Andrew Dietderich. "I may have

misspoken when I said it happens like that ever time."

Misspoken? Exactly how does one make a mistake like that when working for a prosecuting attorney's office?

Does Padzieski mean that they don't require anything in writing before deciding to launch an investigation into the affairs of a private citizen? What exactly is the benchmark for making the decision to investigate in the first place?

Is Padzieski saying that I could call his office and throw around some unsubstantiated allegations, and his office would automatically investigate?

If that's the case then this country that we call home is becoming a very scary place in which to live.

And that's what's troubling me this week. Jim Nield has the right to challenge or question the actions of Karen Woodside and the Northville Township Board of Trustees. You might not like his style, or his tactics, but you must respect the fact that he has the right to take action.

And to be sure, if Jim Nield did do something wrong, then his actions should be investigated. But in this case Nield has receipts to back up his asser-

tions of innocence, and unless the State Police have uncovered something else in their investigation, the evidence would seem to point in Nield's favor.

Which brings me back to the letter. Walsh said he received one, that it contained information that warranted the State Police to go trudging to Jim Nield's home requesting evidence and interviews. Now we discover such a letter doesn't exist. If that's the case, then why, exactly are we expending tax dollars to investigate Jim Nield?

And who was the person who prompted the investigation? Was it a case where an unsubstantiated rumor found its way to Walsh's office? Does Karen Woodside have any connection? That's a fair question because, you see, it was Karen Woodside who was facing the threat of recall? Did she happen to hear an unsubstantiated rumor, pass it on to her colleague Walsh, who then initiated an investigation?

Unfortunately Walsh and Woodside refuse to return our phone calls. Which is a shame because we'd like to give them the opportunity to answer those questions.

One thing is for certain. If Jim Nield did something wrong, charges need to be brought and the process needs to continue. If, however, Jim Nield did nothing more than exercise his rights as a citizen then the Wayne County Prosecutor's office needs to clear his name immediately, and conduct an internal investigation as to how something like this could happen in the first place.

Primaries make for long(winded) campaigns

Who can blame them. Michigan Democrats plan to try again to move up their presidential caucuses to February 12 next year.

Last week, the Democratic National Committee rejected the state's request to hold caucuses earlier next year. Right now, the rules committee bars any state other than Iowa and New Hampshire from holding caucuses before March 7.

Michigan Dems say they'll try again this summer. After all, Michigan Republicans just moved up their primary election four weeks to February 22.

We already know who the front runner is — polls already show voters clearly favor George W. Bush over Al Gore. They also show few of us know what he stands for. Bad

as that sounds, few of us know what Gore's platform is either, and he's been our vice president for six years.

These presidential contenders were both in town last week stumping for votes ... and saying very little about their positions on the various issues.

Some will argue, like the political party leaders do, that it's still all for the good for Michigan. As long as the primaries and caucuses are set by the parties and the states, it is going to be a competitive process. After all, we are electing someone to a very important position.

That's where I part ways. I say we overemphasize the presidency. We've built around him a cult of personality in which charm and appeal count for more than policy. Only in such an atmosphere could the American public be so entranced with the president's every foible for months on end.

We've come to treat the president as nothing less than elected royalty.

Compare all this presidential election hoopla to the mundane way in which members of Congress are selected. There's a primary, held as late as August in Michigan.

It is clear the framers of our Constitution thought Congress was the more important of the two. Yes, they are co-equal branches of government, but it was Congress that was vested with the power to raise taxes, regulate foreign and interstate trade, raise armies, declare war, launch programs and pass laws. The president is supposed to be the executive, the administrator.

We all seem to understand that at the local level. We all pay more attention to the city council because it the decision making. The mayor or the city manager simply follow those decisions. At the state level, it's the Legislature that gets the focus of our attention. The governor gets plenty of attention too, but most people seem to understand his job is to run the bureaucracy while policy is left to the House and Senate.

At the national level, however, our attention seems unnaturally focused on the actions of one man. And it has a strange influence on the way our country conducts its business.

These are special programs seniors may be eligible for to help meet basic living expenses.

Income Tax
Many seniors are not required to pay any state income tax depending on their income level and source(s) of their income. If your adjusted gross income as computed on the federal 1040 exceeds your personal exemption allowance, you must file a Michigan Income tax return with the state if you file a federal return, even if you have no tax obligation to the state.

When you file your state tax return, you should also complete the credit returns to determine if you qualify for any of the credits.

Homestead property Tax Audit (MI 1040CR)

If your property taxes exceed 3.5 percent of your household income annually, you may receive a portion of your property taxes back from the state in the form of a homestead property tax credit.

Citizens who sent homesteads may also qualify. In order to determine your eligibility, review instruction booklet for the MI-1040CR.

Home Heating Credit (MI 1040CR-7)
A federal credit administered by the state's Department of treasury to help pay for the cost of heating. Based on fuel cost and household income, citizens receive a "draft" which they submit to their energy provider for a credit against their heat cost.

Prescription Drug Credit (MI 1040CR-9)
A credit specifically for seniors to help defray the cost of prescription drugs which typically increase with age (that's a revelation). This credit is computed on the basis of household income and prescription drug cost paid for by the citizen and not reimbursed by the insurance company or Medicare. 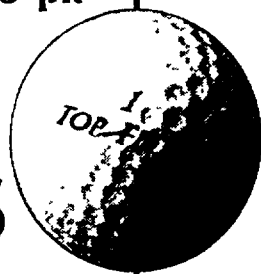

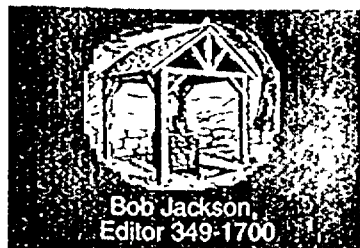

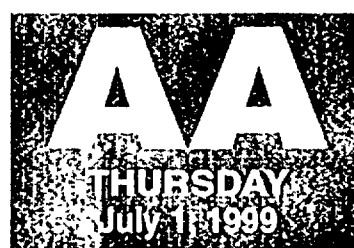

Northville prepares for some grand Fourth of July fun

Northville, get ready for a good old fashioned Fourth of July fun this weekend.

Thousands are expected to visit Northville July 3rd for Celebrate Northville's annual Fourth of July festivities.

And as usual the day's events will begin with a parade. Though it appeared the century-old Independence Day parade through the streets of Northville might be in jeopardy earlier this year, parade organizer Shari Peters said the response of community members has given the event another crack at life.

Some 40,000 persons jammed Northville's streets last summer. The event gets underway at 10 a.m.

"The residents have come forth like I can't believe," Peters said Monday. "We're getting an overwhelming response to this thing."

Deviating just a bit from the tradition of a single parade grand marshal, Peters said seven marshals have been selected from area elementary and middle schools, in step with the overall theme of the event — "Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow."

"It's very child-oriented," she said. "Kids and families love it."

Three color guards will be posted at various locations along the parade route — one at the Northville clock, another at Northville City Hall, and a third near Community Federal Credit Union.

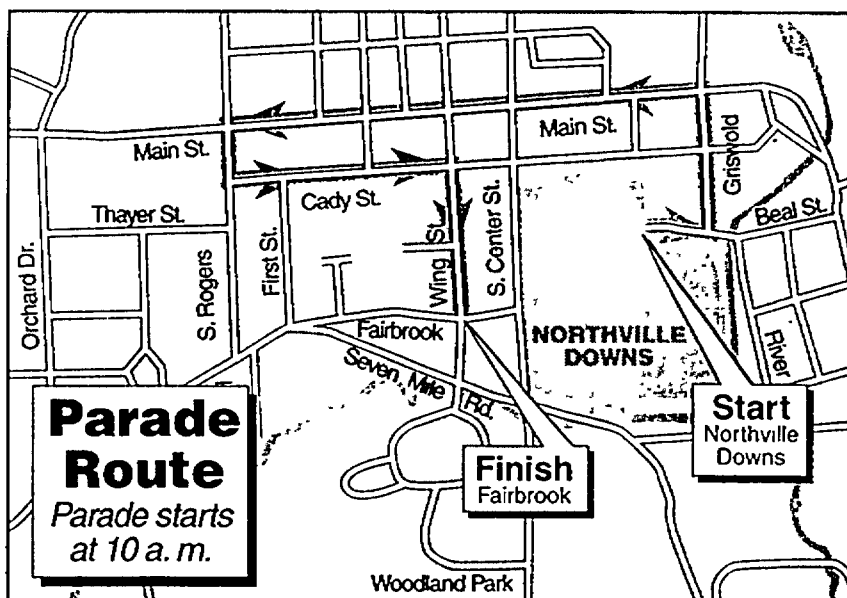
Another variation on traditions of old, Peters said, would be the participation in the singing of the national anthem at the beginning of the festivities. In the past, Peters said it's been not at all uncommon for parade-watchers to line up and seek out spots several hours in advance of the start of the parade, not participating very much in pre-parade activities.

With the anthem being incorporated into the program, Peters was hopeful greater participation would occur.

A bike parade will also take place, with the first-place winner being given a new bicycle, Peters said.

The parade will begin at 10 a.m. at Northville Downs near Griswold, Peters said, and will wind its way through Main, Rogers, and Cady Street.

Mill Race Village will also host several Independence Day events throughout the day, and the highlight of the day will occur under darkness as BFI hosts the annual Fourth of July Fireworks, which are tentatively slated to begin at around 9:30 p.m.

When all was said and done, it was the bat of Jon Cervi that should have been the most feared in the Kensington Valley Conference, not Brendan Hadley's.

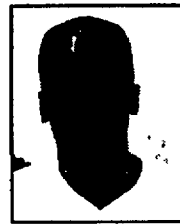

Hockey reclassifications benefits Northville team

Because of the Michigan High School Athletic Association's recent decision to reclassify hockey teams into three equal divisions for the 1999-2000 season, there will be no district hockey tournaments this next year.

Instead, all teams will begin play in the regional round of competition on Monday, Feb. 28, 2000. With the reclassification in place, there will now be three divisions with 45 teams in each.

For Northville, Novi, Hartland and Lakeland, the news is good. Those four teams were the only current Division II teams among the 12 teams in their district and regional tournaments this past spring. All of the others are currently in Division I (1,524 students or more).

"I would suppose it's (division II) going to be

easier," Northville coach Brad O'Neill said. "Anytime you're not playing an Ann Arbor Pioneer, you'd have to have a better chance."

"Personally, I like the (new) division we're in because it seems to have parity."

O'Neill said his team still plans to play many of the same teams it has in the past, many because they're a part of the Suburban Hockey League in which Northville participates in.

"That's something we've had to deal with and it's good experience anyway," he said. "I don't care what division you're in, once you get to the regional finals in the state playoffs, there's going to be some excellent hockey teams."

The upcoming season can begin Nov. 15, with the last regular-season game taking place Feb. 26, 2000. Teams may begin practicing Nov. 1 of this year.

Bryan Watson—Center Field South Lyon Senior

Watson was an ideal lead-off hitter, thanks to his speed — he was the area's leading base stealer and had two triples — and knack for reaching base — his hit 124 and had an on-base percentage of .489. As a result, he led South Lyon with 25 runs scored.

"He did a great job for us," South Lyon coach Mark Thomas said. "Watson always hustled. He was our team MVP."

Watson was named all-district and first-team All-KVC.

Andy Borda—Pitcher Northville Senior

Borda could do it either offensively or on the mound, but it was his 7-2 record and 2.10 ERA that earned him WLAA first-team honors this season.

He had 70 strikeouts as the ace of the Mustang staff. From the plate, he hit .390.

"He improved seemingly with every outing," Newman said. "Andy has outstanding control. He lived on the black, and dominated some games on the mound."

Brendan Hadley—Third Base Novi Junior

Giving credit where credit is due, Hadley was the most feared bat in the conference because of his merits a year ago. Last year he hit over .500 in his first year at

Novi High School.

This year he maintained his high standards by hitting .471 and leading all area hitters with 10 home runs. Despite Cervi driving in 38 runs in the No. 2 slot, Hadley still managed to knock in 24 of his own.

Looking for numbers to back up the notion that he was the most feared hitter in the league, one would have to look no further than the league-leading 27 walks he drew this season.

Chris Hardin—First Base Lakeland Sophomore

A first baseman, Hardin is halfway towards becoming a four-time all-area selection. This is already his second appearance on the team, having also made it as a freshman.

Hardin was Lakeland's best hitter, with an average of .361. The sophomore left-hander drove in 21 runs, scored 20 runs, hit seven doubles and three homers.

Hardin was an all-district and second-team All-KVC selection.

Shaun Houck—Outfield Lakeland Junior

Houck, a junior, started the season at second base, moved to the outfield, and did some pitching along the way.

"Defensively, he was one of the better outfielders in the league," Lakeland coach Aaron Strand said. "He did a little of everything for us."

"Houck beat us pitching," Milford coach Jason Melynchek said. "All year he was solid at everything he did, not just in one particular spot."

Houck hit .292 and had an on-base percentage of close to .500, all the more dangerous given Houck's 13 stolen bases. He had 16 RBI.

Houck was a second-team All-KVC honoree.

Evan Edwards—Shortstop Northville Senior

An all-around athlete who made the first team last year and was a first-team hockey selection this past winter, Edwards was quite possibly the most valuable player on the Northville team.

Offensively, defensively, he did it all at one of the toughest defensive positions on the field. As the lead-off hitter, he hit .446, drove in 24 runs while scoring 23 himself. He stole 22 bases as well. For his career, he hit over .440 and was a perfect 41 for 41 in stolen-base attempts.

"He was extremely valuable to our ball club," Newman said. "He made the routine plays as well as some Major League type plays."

Matt David—Designated Hitter Milford Junior

Hurt much of the year, and batting well below the Mendoza Line nearly halfway through the season, David was on fire the rest of the way, peaking with a five-for-five performance in the Redskins' district win against Lakeland.

A second-team All-KVC selection, despite his slow start David ended up hitting .355.

"He led us in most everything," Melynchek said.

A. J. Rowe—Pitcher Novi Junior

His respectable stick wasn't what worried opponents. It was his devastating fast ball.

Only a line drive off the shin of Rowe in the districts kept Novi from a district championship over Brighton. The Wildcats finished third in the KVC, thanks in large part to the arm of Rowe, who fin-

ished with a 4-2 record and an ERA of 1.80. He struck out 84 batters while allowing just 18

walks. He was as greedy as they come, allowing just 26 hits in 42.2 innings on the mound.

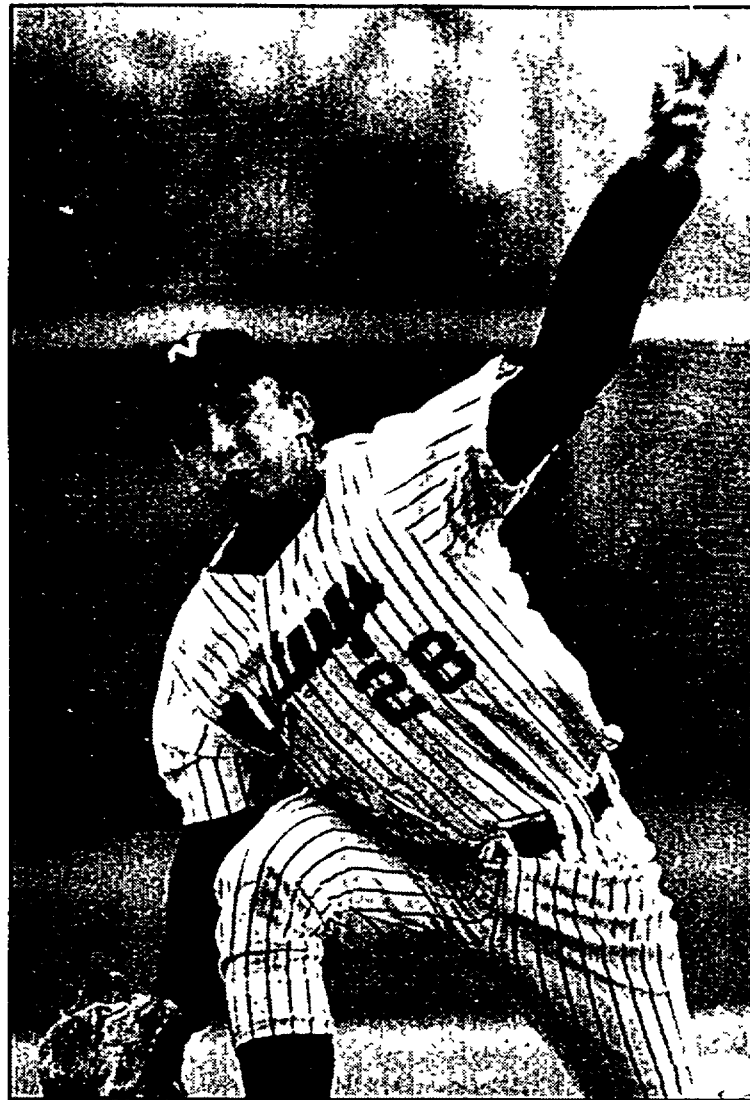

Industry needs to be regulated

I realize the truth about certain situations is not always well received. For example, how do these truths sit with you? "Lifestyle and eating habits alone will decide your physical appearance," or "there is nothing you can do to stop the genetic thinning of the hair on top of your head, or grow the hair back." (I am particularly in denial with this one.)

I also realize we as humans do and will always look for the "quick, easy fix," the "magic solution" if you will. But if I hear one more advertisement about the latest super fat trapper, grabber, dissolver, or whatever pill that simply involves ingesting this magic pill and you will be on your way to the body you have always desired. I think I might lose it.

One cannot help to be bombarded with celebrities demonstrating these super pills on TV. Try to listen to the radio longer than ten minutes without hearing one of the disc jockeys telling us by simply using these type pills, they have lost 20 pounds in two weeks. They are advertised in all the popular magazines, for sale in special kiosks in all the malls, over the Internet, etc., etc.

The supplement industry is not regulated, which simply put means you and I could create a pill and market it any way we want. We could make any and all claims we desire. The need for regulation is a whole other debate, but the need for more thought and investigation on what we put into our bodies and why, in my opinion, is not.

Human nature to seek the easiest solution, coupled with the overwhelming desire to look better, makes it easy to see how this situation has grown. I will openly admit I have fallen for the super shampoo or cream to add thickness to my decreasing crop of hair, and it is still decreasing. I mean, let's be realistic which option do you like for changing your body?

Option A: Take a pill x times per day. Option B: Move more on a regular basis, add some resistance exercise at least twice a week, and alter your eating habits on a consistent basis.

Three problems to consider with Option A (which I know you chose):

- It does not work long term.

If it did, 55 percent of the American adults would not be classified by the National Institute on Health as carrying so much extra poundage that their weight constitutes a serious threat to their health. If they worked we would all take the pills and have the body we want. It also goes against the way the human body functions. I mean, think about it...eat anything you want and take a pill?

• It places physical appearance above and separate from overall health and wellness.

Do we really want to look good above all concerns for our quality of life and health? Is it not a package to look and feel your best long term? Taking a pill and not creating a healthy lifestyle short circuits this equation. A pill does not address the fact that 60 percent of Americans feel stress is negatively affecting their health. A

pill does not address the fact every day millions of older Americans become progressively disabled due to inactivity. A pill does not address the fact we are moving less now than ever, sitting behind 500 channel super TV's and computers. It also does not address the fact the food industry spends billions of dollars encouraging us to eat more, drink more, and snack every chance we get. American restaurants compete on seeing who can offer the biggest and greatest number of helpings, the fullest portions, and the most gargantuan menus. Teaching our kids to "Super Size" everything for pennies more.

• This pill formula sends the wrong message to our younger generation.

Our health care system is riddled with severe problems, spending 30 to 70 percent more on health care than any other industrialized nation in the world (almost \$4,000 per person per year). Ninety-eight to 99 percent of this spending is focused on diagnosis and treatment versus prevention and education. The message of pills versus lifestyle improvement to our young does not move us off this negative path. If we do nothing to change this health care trend, if we do not accept responsibility of our own health and set a positive example for our children, where will health care be in the next 20 years?

The answer for a better body has been, is now, and will continue to be Option B.

HOW TO

Rescue neglected paint brushes

Q. I invested in some quality paint/varnish brushes. I got careless and didn't clean them properly. Now the bristles are as hard as a rock. Paint thinner at this point doesn't have any effect. Can these brushes be saved?

A. Quality brushes, even those that appear to be petrified, can often be revived. It's worth a try. You will need to purchase a commercial brush cleaner to do the job.

There are two types available, a solvent-based cleaner or a water-based brush cleaner. I prefer the solvent-based product which is good for any brush (natural or synthetic bristles) and a must for brushes saturated in oil-based paint or varnish. The water-based product is only good for synthetic brushes. Both cleaning products work to dissolve the hardened paint in the brush bristles.

Brushes must soak in the cleaning solution overnight, and in some cases even longer, to give the solution ample time to work. Use a jar or coffee can large enough to suspend the brush (the handle secured at the mouth of the container so that the bristles are suspended in solution without touching the bottom). Use wire or a clamp to secure the handle in the proper position. If the bristles are allowed to rest on the bottom of the container you will end up with a bent, out-of-shape brush, which is just as unusable as a petrified one. With the solvent-based solution, it is wise to cover the top of the container with foil or plastic wrap (leaving a hole for the brush handle) to prevent evaporation.

Once the bristles become pliable, remove the brush from the container. Use a brush comb to remove any solids still clinging to the bristles. If using a solvent-based cleaner, soak the brush in a clean solution of the product for several hours to remove any residual paint that may still cling to the bristles. You can skip this step if using a water-based product.

The final cleaning step with either solution is to wash the brush in a solution of dish detergent and warm water to remove all of the cleaning solution. Rinse thoroughly with clear water and squeeze as much of the moisture out of the bristles as possible, keeping the bristles flat and uniform. Do not towel dry, ruffling the bristles so that they become bushy and lose their shape. Let the brush air dry.

When storing your brushes, wrap the bristles in plastic or a paper towel, secured with a rubber band. You want to maintain the flat, original shape of the brush. Its best to hang brushes from the holes in their handles during storage. Purchase commercial brush-cleaning products and brush combs where paints and painting supplies are carried.

Q. Several months after repainting our master bathroom, the paint is blistering and lifting. We also have signs of mildew. What should we do to remedy the problem prior to repainting?

A. Bubbles resulting from localized loss of adhesion and lifting of the paint film from the underlying surface are usually caused by a moisture problem, which is also the source of your mildew problem. Applying oil-based or alkyd paint over a damp or wet surface will cause the blistering, as will exposure of latex paint film to high humidity or moisture shortly after a fresh coat of paint has been applied (even though it seems dry). The problem is more likely if there was inadequate surface preparation prior to paint application.

Moisture problems are prevalent in bathroom and kitchen environments. They can also be a problem in other rooms when moisture seeps into the house through exterior walls (less likely with latex paints). If the paint blisters do not go all the way down to the substrate, remove blisters by scraping and sanding, and repaint with a quality acrylic latex interior paint. If blisters go down to the substrate: Remove the source of the moisture, if possible. Repair loose caulking, consider installing vents or exhaust fans. Remove blisters as above, remembering to prime before applying the top coat.

Mildew is caused by the same type of moisture conditions. Bathroom, kitchen and laundry room environments are particularly susceptible. Black, gray or brown spots on the surface of paint or caulk should be tested by applying a few drops of household bleach to the discoloration. If discoloration is bleached away, it is most likely mildew.

Mildew often forms on a surface that tends to be damp, or receive little or no direct sunlight. Failure to prime a bare wood surface before applying paint makes the surface more susceptible to mildew growth. Painting over a substrate or coating on which mildew has not been properly removed just promotes a continuation of the problem. All mildew must be removed from the surface by scrubbing with a diluted household bleach solution (one part bleach, three parts water), while wearing rubber gloves and eye protection. Rinse thoroughly with clear water.

Take precautions to prevent the return of mildew growth by removing the source of moisture as recommended above. Repaint the area with a quality latex paint, adding a mildewicide if possible. There is a special mildew-proof paint on the market, Perma-White marketed by William Zinsser & Co. Inc., available nationwide or contact the manufacturer directly for an outlet in your area. (173 Belmont Dr., Somerset, NJ 08875). This product carries a five-year mildew-proof guarantee. It is moisture-resistant as well as blister proof, self-priming, and comes in both satin-finish or high-gloss coatings.

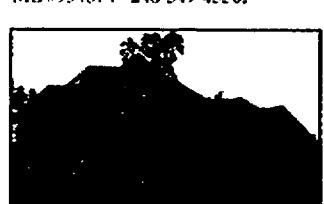

'36 was a banner year for political pennants

Q. The political pennant seen in this photo is from the 1936 Democratic National Convention. It is blue felt with yellow letters and in excellent condition.

Can you give me an estimate of its value?

A. Political pennants have been waving in campaigns since 1896. Although most were made of felt, some paper versions have been found. Collectors usually prefer those decorated with the candidate's image. Franklin Delano Roosevelt was the presidential candidate chosen at the 1936 Democratic National Convention. He enjoyed a landslide victory over Republican Alfred M. Landon. Your pennant would probably be worth about \$75 to \$125.

Q. This mark is on a set of luncheon dishes that I have. The set consists of a service for two sandwich plates, cups, saucers, covered sugar bowl, a creamer and a pair of candleholders.

Could you tell me anything about the manufacturer and the value of my set?

A. Winterling Fine Ceramics in Bruchmühlbach, Palatinate, West Germany, used the mark you provided. They have made earthenware from 1970 to the present.

The value of your set would probably be about \$125.



Q. My mother was given a framed picture by a friend who was more than 100 years old. The picture is of a little girl asleep. She has blonde hair and is holding a bow and an arrow in one hand. Marked on the back are the words "M.B. Parkinson - Copyright 1897. - Cupid Asleep."



This 1936 political pennant is worth about \$75 to \$125.

I would appreciate it if you could tell me its value.

A. The framed pictures of a little girl posing as Cupid Asleep and Cupid Awake could be found in millions of homes in the early 1900s. It all got started when Ohio Art Co. began producing metal frames that included pictures. They were assembled in the Archbold, Ohio, plant by 15 women and then sold to Kresge, Woolworth and Sears across the nation.

They also sold framed landscapes and religious pictures, but the Cupid cuties were the most successful.

Josephine Anderson was the model for photographer M.B. Parkinson. Although the pictures were copyrighted in 1897, it wasn't until 1908 that Ohio

Art first used them. The company expanded and successfully ventured into making metal toys.

Collectors have paid as much as \$450 for the pair framed picture of Cupid Awake or Cupid Asleep.

Q. We have something that we have no idea of what it is! It is made of wood and has four legs. On the top is a wooden tray that measures 16 by 29 inches. On the tray is a wooden paddle that can be cranked to roll along a track. It is marked "Fulton - 640."

We sure would like to know what it was used for, when it was made and what its value is.

A. You have a table butter maker with a handle turned paddle. Fulton made these around 1900. Its value would probably be about \$500.

Zeigler's use of contrasting textures, colors add drama

Be prepared for a show because, as he puts it, he's "pulling out all the stops." It's up to mother nature to determine which flowers will be in bloom for the garden show, but this garden has endless possibilities. The lilacs, peonies and bulbs including tulips and daffodils will be long gone, but in their place will be roses, calla lilies, orchids, begonias and hydrangeas. He's hoping the hollyhocks, red geraniums, and pink and white water lilies will be blooming for the garden walk.

The tour will not only showcase exotic plants that's he's gathered from around the world, but traditional garden favorites. Some of his favorite standbys include red, pink and white rose of Sharon, morning glories, zinnias and hollyhocks.

"People don't use enough rose of Sharon. It's an impact flower," Zeigler said.

He mixes these with his new additions such as poppies from Italy, calla lilies, begonias and five new roses for the garden. For greatest impact, Zeigler prefers to use contrasting textures and colors for dramatic effect, pale and bright mauves as well as smooth and textured leaves.

Even with it's wide variety, the garden has a woodland look, thanks to the large blue spruce and profuse ground cover. Many of the plants are shade loving greenery and ground cover like hostas, silver beacon and snow on the mountain.

"It's a bird and animal sanctuary," Zeigler said of his gardens.

The grounds are a local haven to birds and small animals. Many of the bird houses have families. The back yard features a pond, which is home to frogs and large golden koi. This winter, a male pheasant settled in a blue spruce. Zeigler's also raises exotic pigeons, which roost in their pigeon cove on the north side of the house.

This Northville gardener is not overly fussy with grooming, pulling only big weeds.

"A lot of this stuff takes care of itself, and the greenery stays," he said.

In fact, with the ivy, holly and the evergreen bushes and trees, there's still lots of color in the middle of winter, he said.

He admits he can easily get lost in a project once he sets foot in his gardens.

"I'll get in my yard to do something for a few minutes and it'll be an hour later."

Zeigler's yard is not only a source of beauty, but ingenuity for anyone who's tried to conceal a less than desirable view. In his case, it's an entire railroad track. Before his landscaping, it was in full view. Now, you can only hear the train, scarcely see it. He's also cleverly concealed electric meters behind shutters converted into cupboards. The cupboards double as a gardening center for him.

Look for Zeigler's special accents, like antique bricking for edging, and antique farm equipment used as props in garden beds.

Burning bright

Forever Candles turns attic memories into keepsakes

How many of you know exactly where your wedding bouquet is - maybe in a box, in the attic? Jeff Mahakian and Nicole Currier of Forever Candles would like to suggest an alternative. Rather than a dusty, crumbly mess, they create a one-of-a-kind, hand-made candle that will last forever.

"We thought this would give them a different option. It's something you don't want to throw away, you can do something with it," Nicole Currier said.

It works something like this: a customer brings in their bouquet. Mahakian and Currier explain the process and discuss ideas with the client. The flowers, ribbons and other embellishments from the bouquet are used to fill a glass container which creates the candle. Currier likes to create what she calls "a picture on the front and back of the candle."

"People really want to know what's in there," she said.

After the flowers and other ingredients are arranged, a sturdy cotton wick is inserted and then a colorless, odorless and smokeless oil is added.

The wedding candles are only one small portion of what the young couple has to offer using the concept of everlasting candles. The

candles come in a variety of colors, designs and sizes. The hard part is choosing what design you prefer.

There's a forest blend with pine cones, dried oranges and cinnamon sticks. There's a white blend with dried apples and white mello berries. For a totally different twist, how about layered pasta and beans candles? A couple of their most popular include the burgundy blend and the Victorian blend. The jars also come in a variety of styles so that customers have almost endless choices.

The couple is highly selective on the ingredients that they use.

"Mainly what we do is hand blend dried flowers. It's important that they're all natural," Currier notes.

All natural ingredients are necessary, because some potpourri's contain oils and colors that would break down. The couple uses specialty suppliers, as well as collecting some of their own materials, such as pine cones and fruits. When using all natural ingredients, the flowers in the candles last forever, just as their name implies.

"The dried apples and oranges have to be done just right. If they're too dry, they'll crack. If they're not dry enough, they mold."

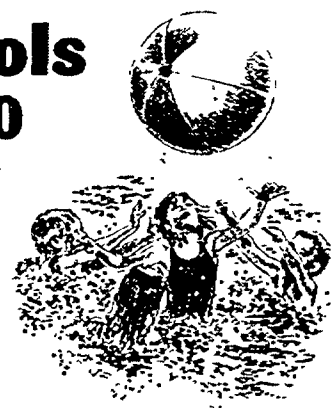

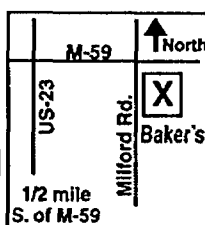

Income, it has been difficult for many home-office workers to meet the principal place of business test.

NEW RULES MAKE IT EASIER TO QUALIFY

The new home-office deduction rules that went into effect earlier this year contains a more liberal definition of your principal place of business. Under The Taxpayer Relief Act of 1997, starting Jan. 1 of this year, a home office qualified as a principal place of business if both:

- the office is used by the taxpayer to conduct administrative or management activities of a trade or business; and
- there is no other fixed location of the trade or business where the taxpayer conducts substantial administrative or management activities of the trade or business. Administrative and management activities might include scheduling appointments, billing, ordering supplies and bookkeeping.

This change is likely to be a great help for workers like

plumbers, musicians, outside sales representatives and others who perform their services outside their offices but do their billing and carry out other business-related tasks from a home office.

The fact that you may conduct management activities in a non-fixed location, such as your car or hotel room, will not cause you to forfeit the deduction. Similarly, conducting some management activities in another fixed location of the business does not mean you lose the deduction, as long as those activities are not substantial.

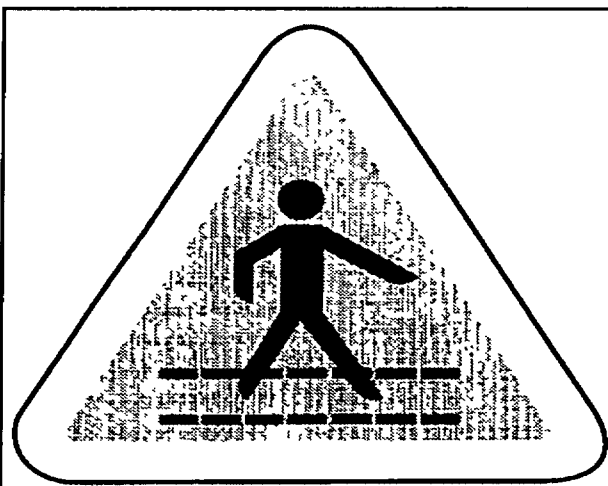
The other requirements for qualifying as a home office remain in effect. The space you designate as your home office must be used regularly and exclusively for business. (In the case of an employee, that use must be for the convenience of your employer.) Bear in mind that occasional or incidental use of a home office will not satisfy the regular use requirement even if the space is used exclusively for business. Exclusive use means that the space you designate as your home office may not be used for any personal or family

activities that don't meet the home-office requirements. There is an exception to the exclusive use requirement if your home space is used for storing inventory or product samples of a business selling retail or wholesale products.

SELLING YOUR HOME

Unfortunately, the news is not all good for home-office owners who sell their homes. When a portion of your principal residence is used as a home office and you have taken a home-office deduction on your tax return, you may lose part of another tax benefit. For homes sold at a gain on or after May 7, 1997, that portion of the home on which you claimed depreciation does not qualify for the home-sale exclusion of \$500,000 (\$250,000 for single filers). Instead, the depreciation you have taken is recaptured at the rate of 25 percent.

Many people fear that deducting a home-office is akin to waving a red flag at the IRS. Although taking the home-office deduction may somewhat increase your chances of an audit, most CPAs would agree that you should not let that dissuade you from taking the deduction if you qualify.

Jeff Mahakian said.

The original instructions suggest to burn the oil half way down, at that point in time, a scented oil may be added. Scented oils can be purchased at a variety of stores including Target and Meijers. Forever Candles also carries several scents as a service to their customers including vanilla, cinnamon and apple, cranberry, pine, lilac and country meadow. Many customers prefer to stick with the unscented oil, because of sensitivity to the scents or allergies.

The candles burn slowly, about an ounce every five hours. The larger candles will burn nearly 125 hours before they need a refill of oil. The oil can be replenished as needed. It's the equivalent of the modern day oil lamp.

Mahakian said. The couple said the Forever Candles make a great housewarming or wedding gift because many of them can blend in with any decor. Currently they are successfully selling a majority of their wares through fine art and craft shows, fitting in both categories well. Locally they will be attending Milford Memories celebration this summer. Last year they began attending shows out of state as well. In the future, they hope to expand on their wholesale business.

If the Founders Festival seems a little different this year, maybe even a little better, you can probably attribute the change to Mike and Sandra Watts.

Nowadays, Tait is self-employed in the specialty advertising field, selling the pens, key-chains and such that banks, Realtors and others give to customers.

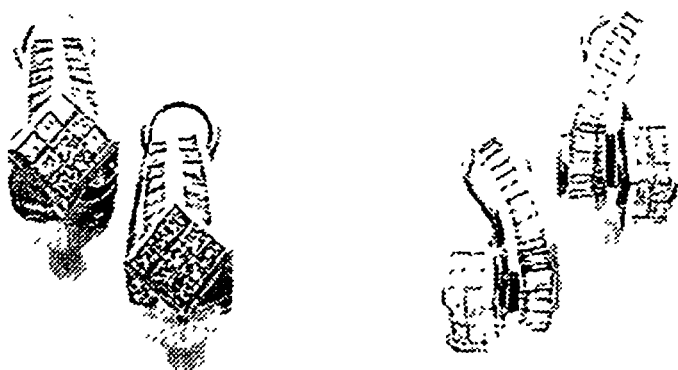
He keeps busy on the side with 30-50 dates a year as Bloono.

standardized and raised. Lauhoff anticipates that vendors will contribute more than \$25,000 to the general welfare of the festival this year.

Organizers are likewise hoping that the Watts' marketing push will bring more people to the party. "We're confident there's a good number of people who don't know what goes on at the festival," Lauhoff said.

Sponsors have been sought and signed, including Botsford Hospital, the Farmington Observer, WKQI radio, Metrobank and Budweiser.

The chamber of commerce is still subsidizing the festival's \$50,000 cost with 20 percent of the profit from its raffle, but Watts hopes that won't be necessary in a few years.

"It's a great location, (and) the two cities work together well," he said.

Jody Soronen, who ran the last 16 extravaganzas, left the employ of the Farmington/Farmington Hills Chamber of Commerce. Nevertheless, she returns this year as narrator of the parade.

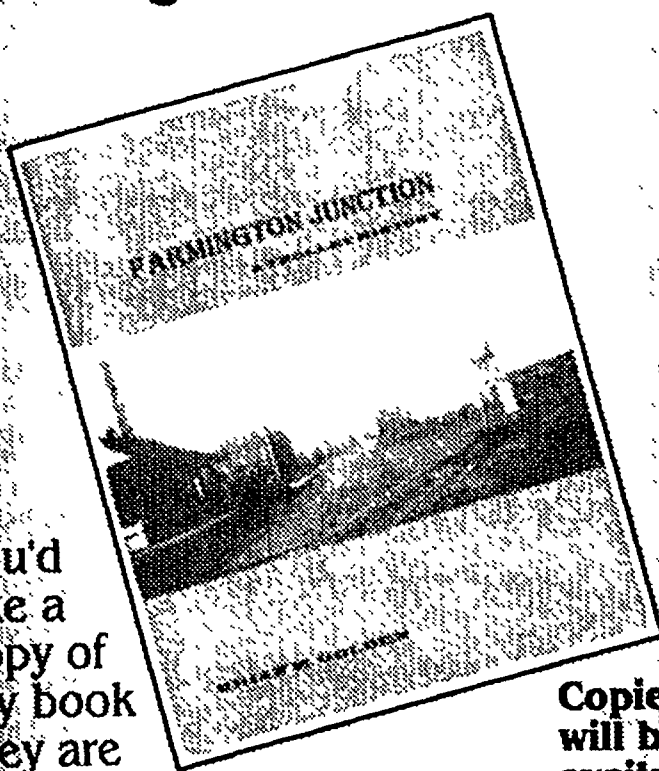

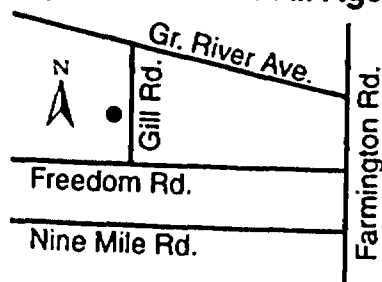

The rest of the singers and bands will perform Friday and Saturday at the Showmobile in the Big Apple Bagel parking lot on Grand River. Some of them are profiled here:

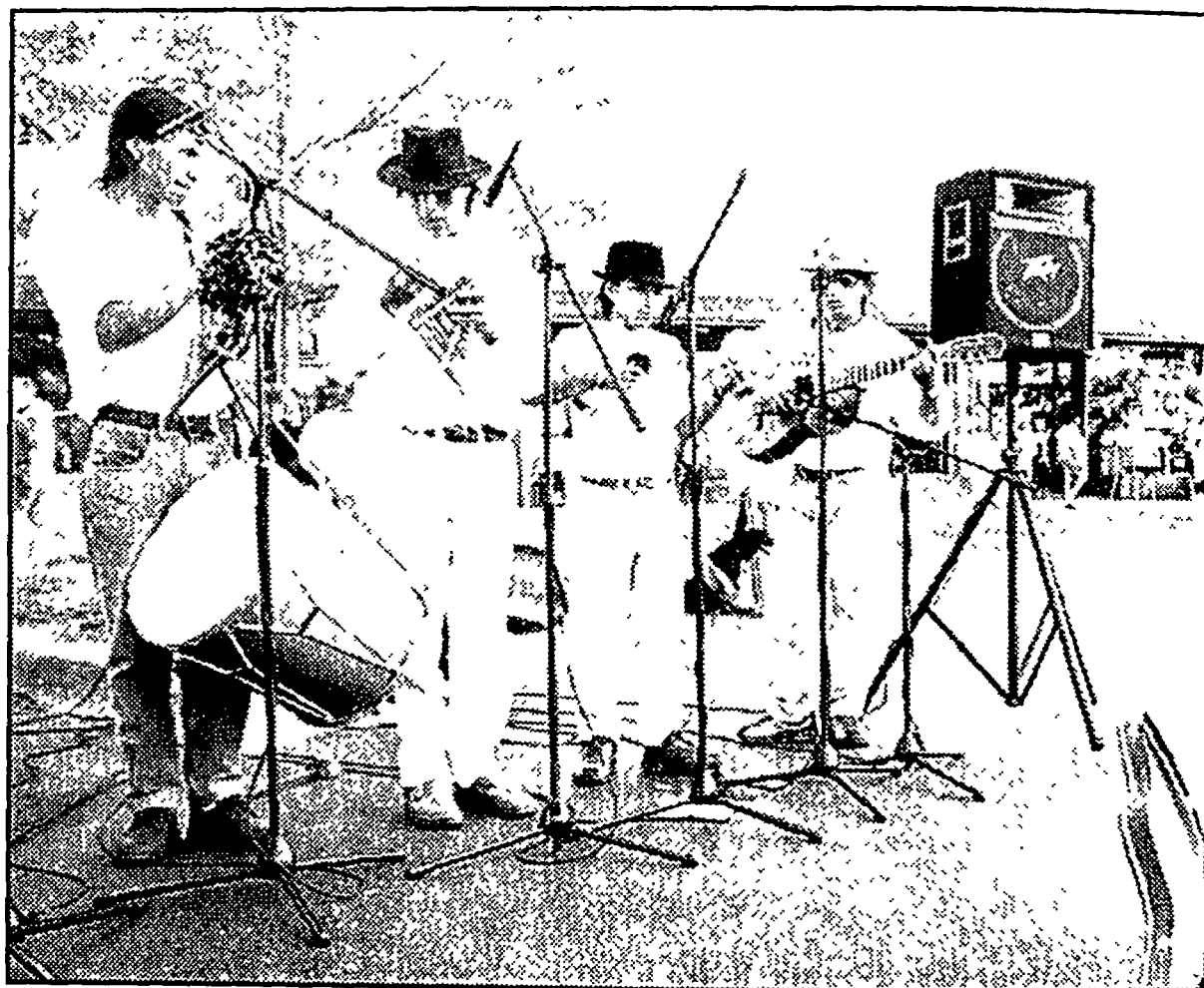
Imperial Swing Orchestra

Don't rain on my parade

The Founders Festival parade has long been one of the Shriners favorite venues, and this year will be no different.

"That's one of the biggest audiences we have," said Shriners spokesman Al Koury.

The parade is mandatory for 20 local "units" comprising 250 men who will become clowns, Keystone Kops, Scottish Highlanders, cowboys and Indians for the occasion.

Flip, flop, fly: Circus is here

The Kelly Miller Bros. Circus returns to Farmington Hills for two shows at 4:30 and 7:30 p.m. Thursday, July 8, at Founders Sports Park.

The circus includes elephants, horses, clowns, high-wire acts and acrobats. A petting zoo will be open all day.

Begun in 1938 by Obert Miller and his sons, Kelly and Dory, the Al G. Kelly Miller Bros. Circus, now known simply as Kelly Miller, has entertained millions of American and Canadian citizens.

The Oklahoma-based show travels on a fleet of 25 vehicles and requires an area of some 90,000 square feet to set up on. The circus big top, imported from Italy, has a seating capacity of 1,500 and is made of waterproof vinyl. The tent is 120 feet by 130 feet and 37.5 feet high and is supported by more than a quarter mile of heavy gauge aluminum tubing as well as several miles of rope, steel cable and chain.

More than 65 people are traveling on this year's Kelly Miller tour through 16 states.

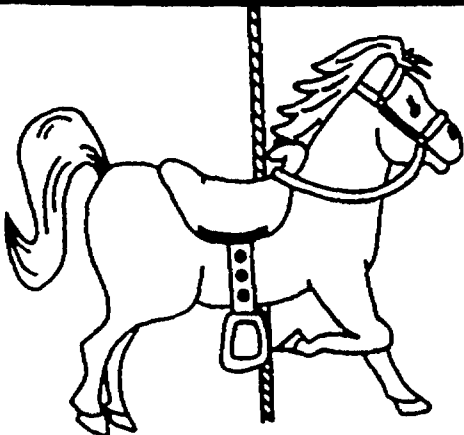

Get the lead out

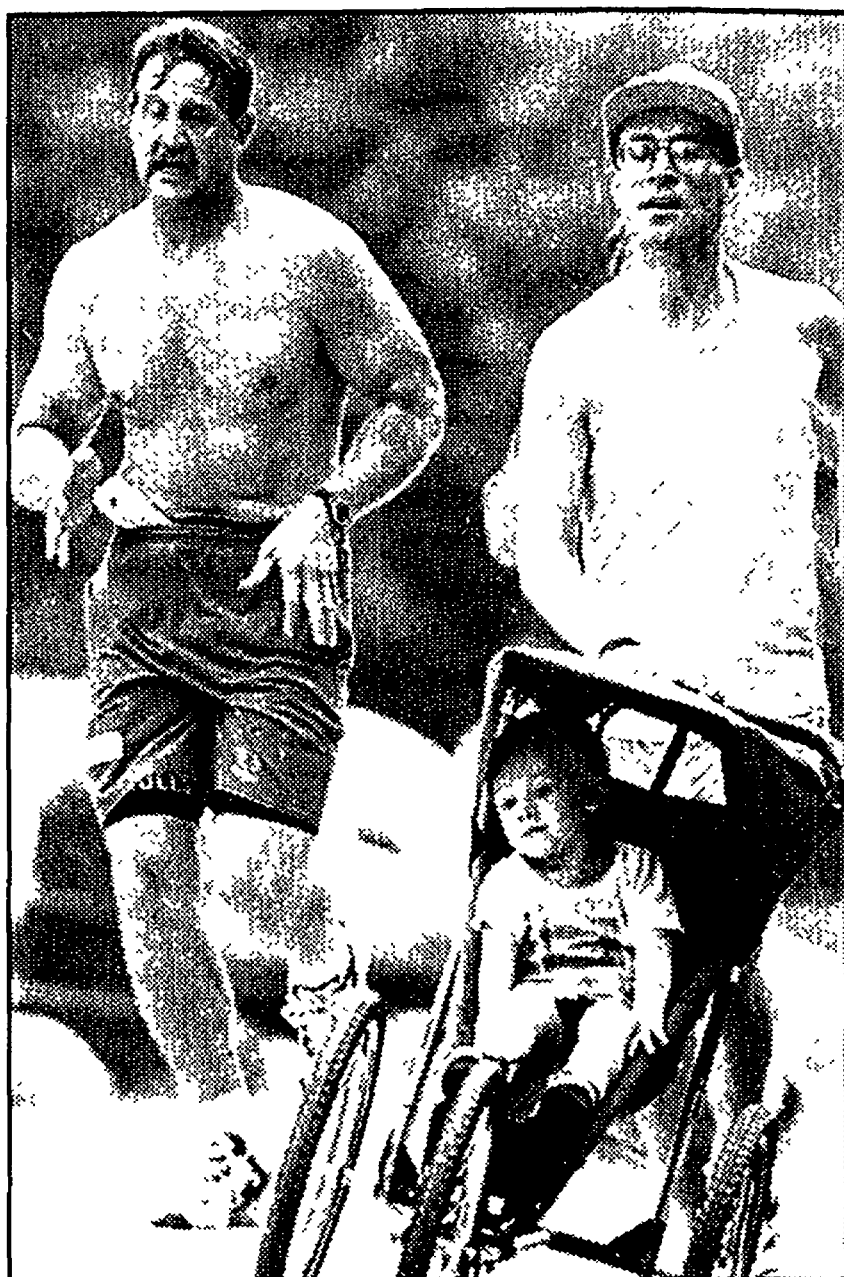
The Farmington Founders Festival 4-mile run, 3-mile walk and 1-mile kids run will hit the streets Saturday, July 10.

Midwifery: A Different Approach to Labor

Who will deliver my baby? This thought raced through Michelle Friss's head. Eight months pregnant, her days were already filled with holiday run-arounds: cooking, battling mall crowds, impressing in-laws. Friss did not want to hear that she could not schedule an appointment with her regular OBGYN. With time running out, Friss decided to use a midwife for her third child's delivery.

Midwives are not usually the mother's first choice for delivery. However, midwives are highly educated alternatives for obstetric and gynecological care. Midwifery is covered by most major insurance companies, such as Blue Cross Blue Shield. In addition, most are registered nurses with advanced training in obstetrics and certification by the American College of Nurse-Midwives. These 5,000 certified nurse midwives are present for about 220,000 deliveries throughout the United States each year.

Still, misconceptions surround midwifery. Some mothers still picture struggling through the fury of labor while a midwife runs around their house with boiling water. However, not all midwives deliver in the patient's home. "Actually, we don't do home deliveries," says Cheryl Bachman, a certified nurse midwife with the Integrated Health Associates of Ann Arbor. "Our patients deliver at St. Joseph Mercy in Ann Arbor." Bachman says that being in the hospital allows a safety net of doctors in case of an emergency.

As midwives know, the key to a problem-free delivery is prevention and preparation. A woman cannot use a nurse midwife if she has had a history of troubled pregnancy, high blood pressure and dia-

betes, or if she is having a multiple birth.

Nurse midwives can also call for additional assistance when it is necessary. They know when a regular obstetrician is needed and can refer patients when needed. And while they prefer relaxation techniques, midwives can call an anesthesiologist if labor becomes too painful.

Whether you choose to remain at home or in a hospital, midwives can provide the knowledge, the support and the questions to make sure you're as comfortable as possible with the birthing process. Midwives are an excellent pregnancy resource—before and after the delivery. Jennifer Cartwright, also a certified nurse midwife with the IHA, says they educate patients about health, nutrition and different relaxation techniques to use in labor, in addition to

providing regular gynecological care, counseling and family planning. They have even been known to lend patients books and offer referrals to a variety of different classes designed for pregnant women. Education continues after delivery to make sure that both mother and child get the proper nutrition.

Still, what makes midwives special is their bond with the mother. Midwives spend a lot of time with each patient, personalizing their care. To Friss's surprise, her midwife, Bachman, stayed throughout most of the labor. Bachman also offered her showers and foot massages to relieve her labor pain.

Midwives also help the mother develop a support network outside of the midwife. "We also try to get women to rely on their support group of family and friends, so they are not only depending on us," says Cartwright.

Despite Friss's initial concerns, she was pleased with her midwifery experience. "Even my husband was thrilled," says Friss. "I think her being there really put us both at ease and I felt more in control of my labor." Bachman added, "The more people are exposed to our care, the more they realize that we can provide quality care for them."

Giving the Gift of Life

Dr. Mark Gravel, director of the University of Michigan Transplant Center, has dealt for years with families whose loved one chose to be an organ donor. Although the families are coping with the grief of losing a loved one, Gravel says, they often communicate a similar belief.

"They tell me that something positive came out of something bad," he says. "They can't change that they lost their loved one, but the organ donation will help someone else live. In some cases, that helps the grieving process because they know a part of their loved one will live on."

For that reason, Gravel knows the importance of organ donation. He's witnessed first-hand the lives it has saved, like the two young girls who recently received a heart and liver transplant after a 7-year-old Flint boy was struck and killed by a car. The boy, who saw a reference to organ donation on TV just a week before his death, asked his mother if he could be a donor. His mother agreed to her son's wish when he died.

Still, there are many cases where patients die while waiting for a transplant. That was the case for more than 3,000 heart, lung and liver patients in the United States last year.

There's no machine you can put them on while they're waiting for a transplant," Gravel says. "You can put kidney patients on dialysis, but there is nothing like that for other patients."

This year, more than 62,000 people in the United States are waiting for a transplant. In Michigan, a new name is added to the patient list every 12 minutes. Fortunately, however, the state has seen a jump in organ donors over the last year.

"Last year, we had 200 donors in the state," Gravel says, "when the most we ever had before was about 173. Prior to last year, we were ranked 46 out of 50 states."

Part of the reason for the jump, Gravel believes, may be due to a change in national regulations mandating hospitals to notify local organ procurement agencies about Medicare patient deaths. Doing so allows the agencies to determine whether the patients are potential organ donors — a decision, however, that is ultimately up to the patient's next of kin.

"It's up to the family or next of kin to give legal consent," Gravel says. "Even if you registered as a donor, it doesn't mean it's 100 percent certain that it will happen. They go to your family, tell them you made your wishes known, and they must give permission for it to happen."

It's a difficult decision, but one that has a strong success rate. The one-year survival rate for a kidney transplant patient is 96 percent, according to LifeLink, a Florida-based, non-profit organ and tissue foundation. For heart recipients, the survival rate is at more than 82 percent, and for liver recipients it is 83 percent.

Seeing Double: Life as a Twin

The town is named Twinsburg. The event? Twins Days. And every August thousands of twins gather in that small suburb of Cleveland, Ohio, for one reason: to celebrate their twinness.

But don't expect to see Jodi Langlois there.

"We try to get away from that," says Langlois, 19, of Livonia. "My sister Jamie and I don't think we're alike. We don't think we look alike. And we don't think we act alike. We think we're different from one another."

Try to explain that to anybody who grew up with the twins. Jodi says that people had a difficult time telling the two apart when they were young, and that they were always asked about being a twin.

"We'd get asked some of the stupidest questions," she says with a laugh. "They even asked if we shared the same birthday."

Silly questions aside, however, Langlois says it's been fun being a twin—even though the two have tried so hard to be accepted as individuals.

"People don't understand that looking alike makes somebody strive harder to be their own person," she says. "We try so hard to get away from looking alike. My hair is light now; hers is dark. We went to extremes sometimes to be different from each other."

That's also the case with their personalities. Jodi describes herself as being more serious than her "party animal" sister. The two, however, have very similar career goals. Both attend Schoolcraft college and plan to major in public relations after they both transfer to Wayne State University. The only difference? Jodi is considering a minor in journalism.

Not only do Jodi and Jamie share a college major, they also share a close bond. So close, in fact, that the two say that they can sense when something is wrong with the other.



"I would know when Jamie's hurt," says Langlois, who adds that they also finish each other's sentences. "I really believe that there's a certain ESP between twins."

When the two were in fourth grade, Jamie fell off her bike and lay unconscious. Her twin sister felt the pain. "I was totally sick to my stomach," Jodi remembers. "I immediately didn't feel good. There have been other times like that, too."

So through the good times and the bad, Langlois says, she wouldn't ever give up having a twin.

"You always have a friend, no matter what," she says. "You're closer to a twin than you are to other siblings."

But just how common is being a twin? Not too uncommon, according to the National Center for Health Statistics. The probability of having twins is one in 38. Four of every 1,000 births results in identical twins; about 30 of every 1,000 results in fraternal twins.

And although there are two-thirds more fraternal twins than identical twins, don't rule out the possibility that it can happen to you. Only fraternal twins run in families; identical twins can happen to anybody.

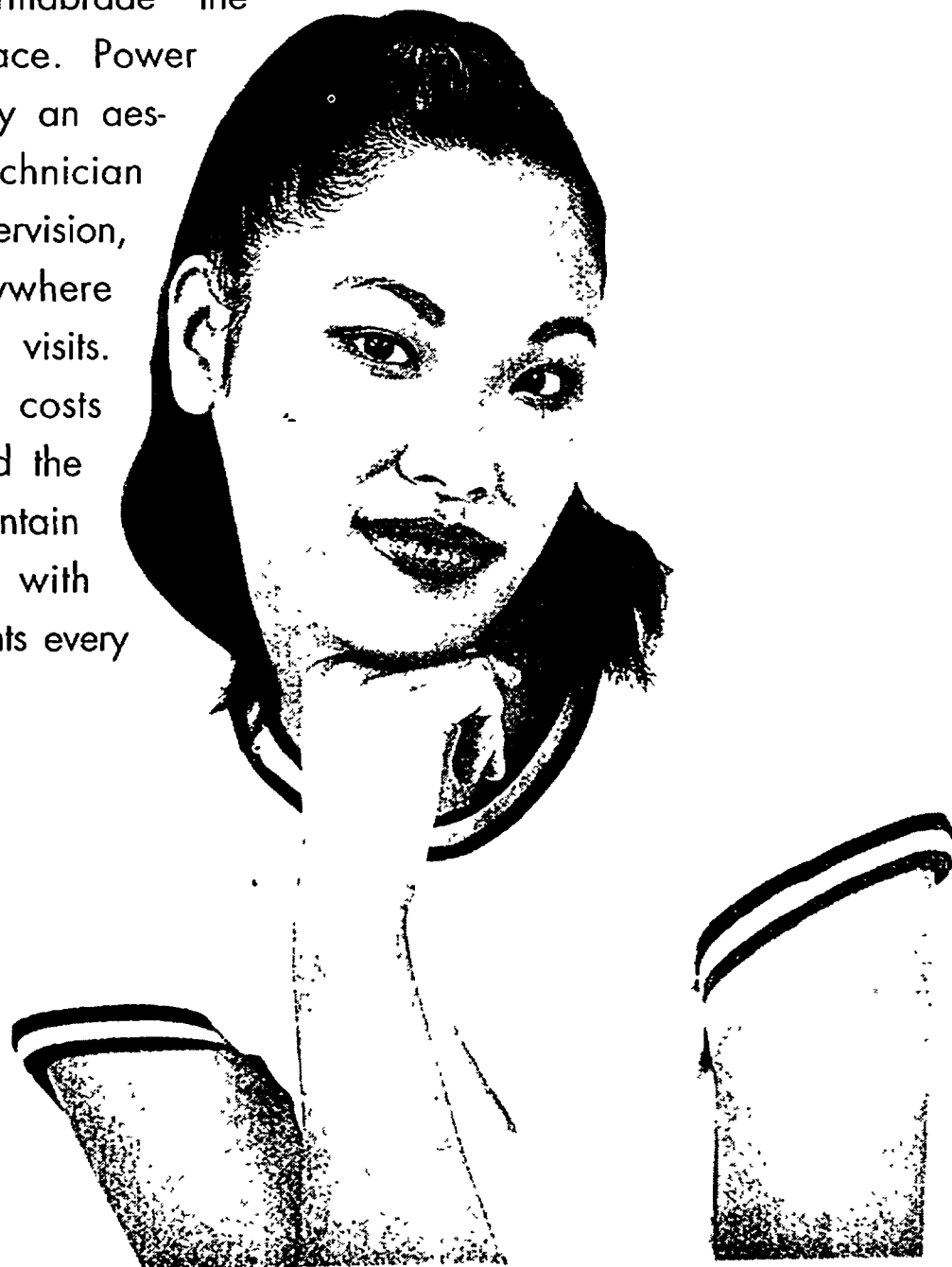

Imagine biting into poached salmon smothered in cucumber dill sauce. Imagine tasting a mix of gourmet greens tossed with goat cheese and topped with a walnut oil vinaigrette. And between each taste, imagine sipping a delicious white wine.

Now imagine your surroundings. A small, intimate bistro perhaps? A candle-light dinner on the water?

Instead, try a nearby park or maybe your own backyard.

If it sounds too good to be true, it's not. Picnics are no longer a Fourth of July anti-fighting fest of overcooked hot dogs and hamburgers. These days, anything goes—and that includes having a gourmet meal in the park or at the beach.

"A while back, we catered a picnic where we set up an individual basket for everyone and put some salmon, cheese and pate in there," says Sonja Szakal, catering manager and chef at Nino Salvaggio Strawberry Hill in Farmington Hills. "We added small splits of champagne, as well as some grapes and peaches."

And the result? "It worked out very well," Szakal says. "Everyone seemed to love it."

Poached salmon is just one of the options available for gourmet picnickers. Grilled chicken breast marinated with orange juice and dried cranberries is another option. So are vegetables brushed with olive oil. And a rose petal salad—romaine lettuce tossed with different rose petals and topped with raspberry vinaigrette—is perfect for the hot days of summer.

"There really are a lot of options," Szakal says. "It depends what you're interested in."

For the summer months, a cold soup like gazpacho is a great suggestion. So are small tomato sandwiches with the crust cut off. Even cold fried chicken—a staple of family picnics—can make a picnic special.

Just remember to keep things on the cool side. Picnic foods should be kept in the cooler until they're ready to be eaten, Szakal says.

A great way to keep things looking great and safe? Pre-made picnic baskets.

Available at many stores—often coming with plates and silverware—these baskets can store your food and beverages while keeping everything looking good. Szakal suggests buying cooler packs, available at



drugstores and hardware stores, and hiding them beneath a linen napkin. Pack the food on top. Your picnic foods will look good—and be safe when it's time to eat.

And what's a meal without dessert? Szakal has a few suggestions for that, too.

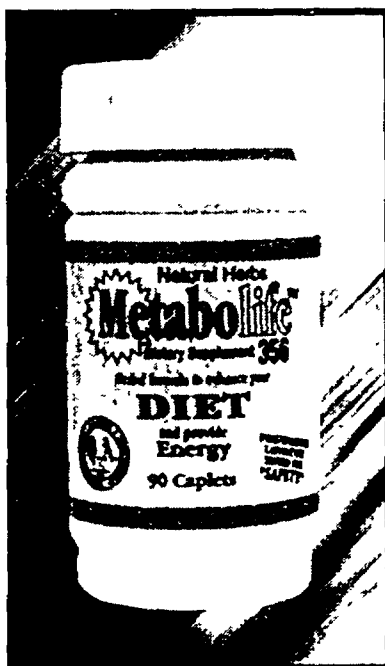
"You can do some nice fruits like strawberries with sour cream and brown sugar for dessert," she says. "Or you can make a raspberry pie with whipped topping."

Her other suggestions include peach cobbler or cookies.

"There are many options," Szakal says. "The only thing that would be difficult are desserts that must be kept refrigerated, like chocolate mousse."

And after a long day of picnicking, don't forget to offer your guests a refreshing cold drink.

"Freshly squeezed lemonade is a great choice," Szakal says. "It really fits well with summer."

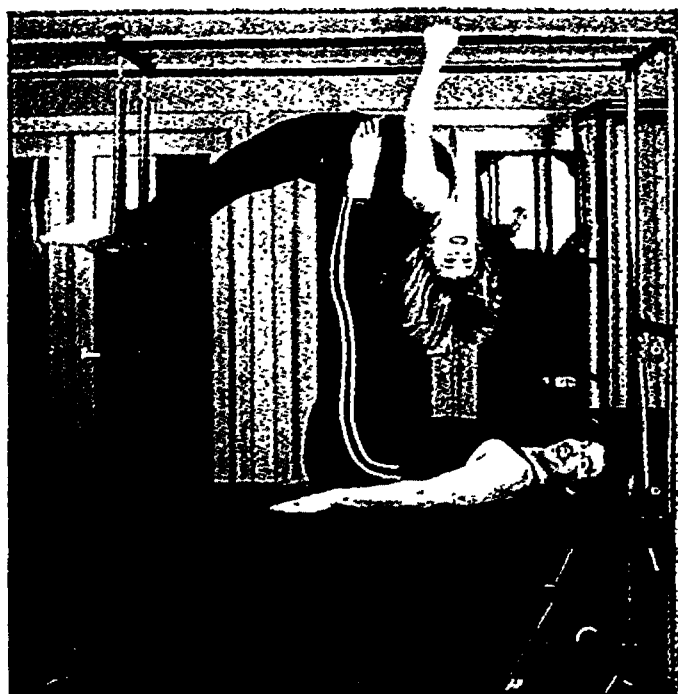

Do tightly choreographed aerobic routines make you feel like an over-caffeinated cheerleader? Do you have shin splints from climbing to the moon and back on the Stairmaster? Then you should consider a relatively unknown exercise system known as the Stott Pilates (pih-LAH-tees) Conditioning Method.

The method guarantees total body conditioning and increases strength and flexibility without lifting a dumbbell. Well-known among dancers and the wealthy for decades, the method is quickly gaining popularity and taught in two local fitness studios: The Health of It, in Beverly Hills and Equilibrium, a Bloomfield Hills studio.

The Stott Pilates method is deceptively simple: resistance exercises, using equipment specifically designed for the method, emphasizing careful movements. Each is

designed to stretch the muscles involved, opening joints and relieving tension, while protecting your neck, back, and knees from injury. Specific breathing patterns and fewer repetitions, combined with concentrating on trunk stabilization and proper body alignment, result in total mind-body conditioning.

The Stott Pilates' neuro-muscular resistance exercises are based on the 70-year-old teachings of exercise pioneer Joseph Pilates and adapted over a decade ago by former professional dancer Moira Stott with input from medical professionals.

This method has a variety of benefits, making you look and feel good. "It lengthens your legs and arms," said Equilibrium co-owner and former student of dance Jan Silverman. "It stabilizes your core posture muscles, increases your flexibility and body awareness, and balances your mind and body. A lot of doctors send their patients to us for exercise. A lot of doctors like the method for themselves."

Pilates has other rewards, according to Wendy Johnson, of The Health of It. "It's a great stress reliever. It's really relaxing." And though Pilates is not about vanity, "vanity is a bonus."

In addition, the method works for all types of people, young or old, fit or unfit. "It's an exercise you can do and keep doing whether you're 16 or 70, pregnant

or not pregnant," added Johnson. "You can do it for the rest of your life."

To avoid the injuries and other lack of instruction pitfalls that plague many weight-lifting gyms in the area, a consultation and a few one-on-one sessions with an instructor are required when beginning to study Stott Pilates.

With one-on-one instruction Pilates can customize a workout to fit the individual's needs, be it rehabilitation or a hard workout. "I cringe when I think of aerobics classes," said former aerobics instructor Johnson. "The instructor can't watch every person to make sure they are doing it right or getting what they need...We want to watch your body line, what you're doing, or else you can injure yourself."

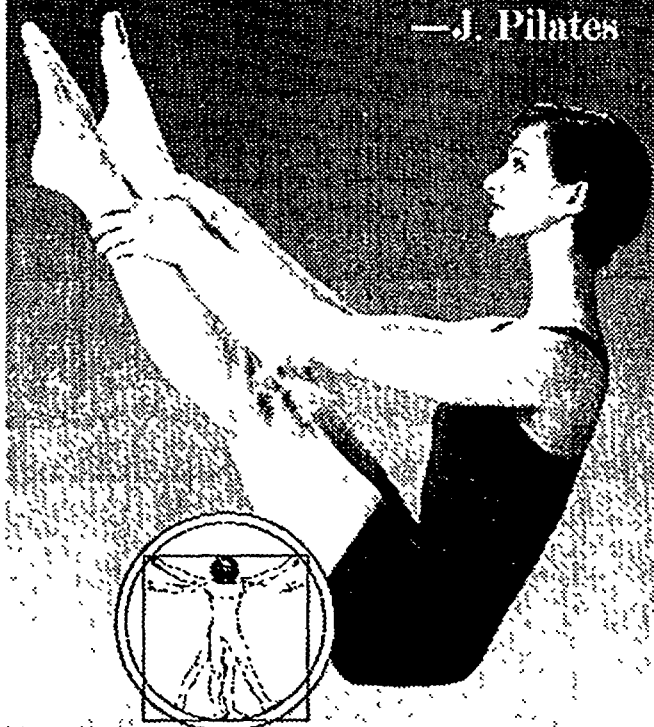

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, in 1997 approximately one in every eight Americans was 65 or older. That translates to over 12 percent of the U.S. population or 34.1 million people!
