Sledding accident has local mother worried

A common childhood activity is more dangerous than one might think, according to local parent Gretchen Schlicker.

Schlicker's 15-year-old son, Andrew Herpich, broke his femur attempting to sled down the backside of a hill in Hines Park at the corner of Five Mile and Sheldon roads.

"I don't think parents realize how dangerous

sledding is," she said.

Her son was with a friend sledding on a round disk sled when he had his accident. Herpich had already successfully made one run down the hill feet first and managed to slide between the two trees at the base of the hill on the sled. However, the second time he wasn't so lucky, his mother said.

"The good thing was he was going head first, which is also dangerous, but because he was

he saw the tree as he was going down. So he was able to turn to avoid it. The bad thing was as he turned to avoid the tree he smacked his leg into it, causing the break," she said.

Schlicker admitted the accident was made worse by the fact her son was sledding down the wrong side of the snow hill. Schlicker believed signs should be clearly posted warning parents and kids to use extra precaution when sledding.

Moving right along: students learn basics in motor skills class

Curious things are happening in Thornton Creek Elementary's Wondergarten. Snowflakes, disguised as students, drifted through their classroom early Wednesday morning, only to change minutes later into sleeping caterpillars and beautiful butterflies.

Yet, these flitting students are doing more than wriggling, they are discovering motor skills that studies show more and more students are lacking.

"The class gives them more body awareness," teacher Kathy Hall said. "It also helps them to have less inhibitions when about performing in front of a group and helps them have self confidence."

Hall recently received approximately \$750 in grant money from the Early Childhood Center to

implement a project called creative movement. Once a week for a month, movement arts specialist Michelle Orow would visit the before and after school program to teach the children to move creatively. The movements help the children to develop gross motor skills. Hall said, teachers are

noticing more children are lacking in these skills than people think. There are several reasons for this she said, which include children spending more time on computers, with video games and watching TV instead of playing outside or coloring and cutting.

The material in a movement education program is based on the structure and knowledge of how people move. Lessons help the children discover body actions — what the body can do, space

McCain wins the city, Bush takes township

Voters in Northville Township did their part to hold up the "fire wall" promised by Gov. John Engler for George W. Bush in the Republican primary, but the rest of the state — including the city of Northville — didn't.

The Texas governor won in Northville Township with 115 more votes than Arizona Sen. John McCain. The total votes were 2,093 for Bush and 1,978 for McCain. Alan Keyes earned 150 votes.

But McCain was the victor in the city of Northville after defeating Bush by 57 votes. The total votes in the city were 739 for McCain and 682 for Bush with 34 percent of registered voters casting ballots. Keyes took 57 votes in the city.

In Michigan, McCain was the winner with 626,244, or 51 percent, of the votes, while Bush took 535,840, or 43 percent. Keyes earned 65,028, or 5 percent, of the votes.

Local officials said they were surprised by the number of vot-

Abbo, Pomeroy sworn in to board

Things were back on track for the Northville Township board of trustees after the swearing in of two members Feb. 17.

Mark Abbo, board trustee, was sworn in as treasurer and Bill Pomeroy, township resident, was sworn in as board trustee.

The swearing in came 10 days after the official resignation of Karen Woodside, former board trustee.

"I'm just hoping we can continue to make sure our financial situation remains on sound footing," Abbo said.

The treasurer seat became vacant after Dick Henningsen was appointed township supervisor to succeed Woodside for the remainder of the election cycle, which ends in November. All seven board seats are up for election.

Abbo said he plans to continue to become more involved in learning the intricacies of being the township treasurer, but leave the day-to-day operations up to the finance department.

"I will be the check signer so I expect I will become very intimate

OIS loses tax-exempt status with township

The Northville Township board of trustees has put the brakes on a tax break for a former township business that will bring more than \$1 million to the tax roll.

The board voted unanimously Feb. 17 to revoke a tax exemption given to Optical Imaging Systems, 47050 Five Mile Road, when it moved to the township in 1993.

The exemption allowed OIS to pay taxes on half of its taxable value, which meant \$1.2 million based on its taxable value rate of \$20 million. Removing the exemption could double the amount taken in by the township.

"The motivating factors that brought them here are not there," said Mark Abbo, township treasurer. "Basically, OIS has gone bankrupt."

OIS brought more than 300 jobs to Northville Township when it moved here in 1993. Abbo said Gov. John Engler and Wayne County executive Ed McNamara both pushed to have the company move to the township from out of state. That's the main reason, Abbo said, OIS was given a break that allowed them to pay taxes on half of their taxable value.

However, the Northville Township operation shut down over one

MORE THAN \$3,000 IN CONSTRUCTION TOOLS TAKEN FROM SITE

More than \$3,000 worth of construction tools were taken from a work site on Spring Circle Feb. 19. The incident happened sometime between 3:30 p.m. Feb. 17 and 1 p.m. Feb. 18.

According to a city of Northville police report, Clarkston-based K&D roofing was working on a home located on Spring Circle when unknown person(s) broke into a construction trailer parked at the site sometime during the night.

Among the items taken were: two nail guns worth \$379 each; another at \$100; a framing gun worth \$400; an air compressor worth \$600; a tool box worth \$100; a staple gun worth \$100; a circular saw worth \$300 and a number of other tools.

DETROIT MAN ARRESTED IN CITY FOR OUTSTANDING WARRANTS

A 36-year-old Detroit man was arrested for having nine arrest warrants after being pulled over in the city of Northville.

The incident happened Feb. 17 at 5:47 a.m.

According to a city of Northville police report, police were behind the man driving a 1985 Buick near South Main Street and Seven Mile Road when they stopped him for not having any tail lights.

A background check of the man revealed his license suspended 18 times and nine arrest warrants. One of the warrants was from Redford. Police from the department picked the man up from Northville police.

WIXOM MAN ARRESTED AFTER BEING STOPPED FOR FAULTY LIGHT

A 19-year-old Wixom man was arrested in the city of Northville after being stopped for a faulty tail light.

The incident happened Feb. 15 at 2:30 a.m.

According to a city of Northville police report, the man was pulled over for having a broken taillight lens with a white light showing. When asked for his license the man said he didn't have one on him and when asked if he had a valid license said he didn't know.

A background check of the man revealed he had four license suspensions out of Novi.

He was released on a \$500 bond.

SOUTH LYON MAN PICKED UP IN NORTHVILLE FOR CHILD NEGLECT

A 30-year-old South Lyon man was arrested in the city of Northville for child neglect after being pulled over for a faulty headlight.

The incident happened Feb. 15 at 2:37 a.m.

According to a city of Northville police report, the man was seen driving southbound on Beck Road with a defective headlight. He was pulled over on Beck Road north of Eight Mile Road.

A background check of the man revealed two civil warrants for the man's arrest for child neglect out of Wayne County.

The man was arrested and turned over to Wayne County police.

ARMINGTON HILLS MAN RECEIVES CITATION FOR DRUG RELATED CHARGE

A 23-year-old Farmington Hills man received a citation for possession of drug paraphernalia and reckless driving.

The incident happened Feb. 19 at 12:49 a.m.

According to a city of Northville police report, the man was seen by police to be driving away from a stop sign at Yerke between Johnson and Beal doing fishtails and spinning his tires in the snow. He was stopped at the entrance to Wagon Wheel. When police approached the car they smelled the strong odor of marijuana.

The three passengers and driver all denied having any marijuana despite the odor, a "Dugout" pipe found on the driver and a glass pipe in the truck. After further questioning, one of the passengers admitted to throwing the marijuana out of the truck.

The driver was cited for having drug paraphernalia and reckless driving.

PLYMOUTH WOMAN ARRESTED ON THIRD OUIJ IN SEVEN MONTHS

A 44-year-old Plymouth woman was arrested in Northville Township for drunken driving for the third time in seven months.

The incident happened Feb. 19 at 7:58 p.m.

According to a Northville Township police report, the woman drove into a car stopped for a red light while northbound on Haggerty at Six Mile Road.

When police questioned her as to what happened she said she "didn't

know, I just hit him." Due to her confused and dazed state, police asked her how much she had to drink, she said nothing. However, a strong odor of alcohol was detected so the woman was given a series of sobriety tests of which she had difficulty with including a preliminary breath test in which she blew a 0.32. In Michigan, 0.10 is considered too intoxicated to drive legally.

The woman was arrested. A background check of the woman revealed she was arrested twice in July of 1999 for drunken driving.

As a result, her license plate was taken, destroyed and a warrant is being sought by township police against the woman.

DEADWOOD BAR AND GRILL BURGLARIZED IN MIDDLE OF NIGHT

An unknown person(s) broke into Deadwood Bar and Grill and stole \$884 in rolled coins and wrapped dollars.

The incident happened Feb. 14 between 3 a.m. and 8 a.m.

According to a Northville Township police report, the unknown person(s) entered the restaurant after snapping some telephone lines and disarming the alarm system. The restaurant was searched by the suspects until they found a safe with money in it.

Of the money in the safe, \$884 was taken. However, the culprits managed to miss \$5,000 kept nearby.

OCC takes steps to improve tech systems at school

Oakland Community College took another step forward Monday in its efforts to modernize its information network.

The Board of Trustees awarded a \$1.35 million contract to Clover Technologies of Wixom for enhancements to its data network in a 5-0 voice vote.

Already, every OCC classroom is connected to the network and computers in the college's labs are being replaced with Internet capable machines.

The enhancement approved Monday will add new "ports," add capacity and improve security on the network. The contract will also expand the network to accommodate video transmission.

"The purpose for adding new ports is to advance an important aspect of OCC's mission state ... to promote the infusion of modern technology into the college's teaching and learning processes," said Chief Information Officer Bruce Martin.

An example of that infusion is that a number of conventional classrooms will be converted to provide each student with a computer.

Some \$300,000 of the contract will go to maintenance, including the installation of safeguards that periodically check the data system to make sure it is operating properly and give early warnings of possible failures.

When complete, the system will allow staff to register students, issue checks or scan financial records all from the same station, which one of the reasons for the emphasis on security.

The OCC board approved the first phase of the technology plan, \$7.2 million for the installation of a new data network, in April of 1998.

The infrastructure, which reaches every classroom on all five OCC campuses, is now complete. To accomplish the project, more than 7,000 connection points, 12,000 feet of fiber optic cable and 1.5 million feet of copper wire were installed in 18 months.

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Northville.com? Website for city slated for creation

The city of Northville soon will be another pit stop for those traveling on the information superhighway.

The Northville Downtown Development Authority has approved a proposal from citysearch.com for the development and maintenance of a website for the downtown in the amount of \$750 a month.

The approval means residents soon will have access city information at the click of a button.

"It's a very important tool of communication that we haven't had before," said Gary Word, Northville city manager. "It will allow citizens to have access to information they might not get otherwise."

Developing a site is one of the Northville Downtown Development Authority goals for 2000. Lori Ward, DDA director, did not return telephone calls to the *Northville Record*.

According to a memo to city council, though, she said the DDA hoped to "design and implement a Web site for the entire DDA District to help promote the DDA area."

Additionally, she said, the DDA wanted to "work with the Northville Chamber of Commerce and the Northville Central Business Association to develop a coordinated site which would benefit the overall business community" and "provide marketing support for the website."

The DDA started working on a website for the city of Northville last year and has heard several proposals from the company city-

search.com.

Such features being considered include: pages for communicating when meetings will be held; a photo gallery; a directory; local TV programs and events with residents; a place where viewers could deal with city staff directly to do things such as pay bills. Additionally, local businesses could use the medium to advertise.

Laurie Marrs, director of the Northville Chamber of Commerce, said the chamber's website has been up for

about one year. She has seen the benefits and said the city should as well.

"We've had people that have applied for different things such as the art show and business showcase after printing out the registration form on their computer and sending it back in," Marrs said. The chamber and applicants benefit by saving time and money.

"The most important thing the site does is let people in the community know what, when and where events are happening," she said.

Word said the chamber's motivation for being on the Internet may be slightly different than the city's, which would be slightly more pragmatic.

"The city's perspective is that the website would be best used to communicate with residents," he said. "And with Northville being a pretty sophisticated community, it should fit well with the community."

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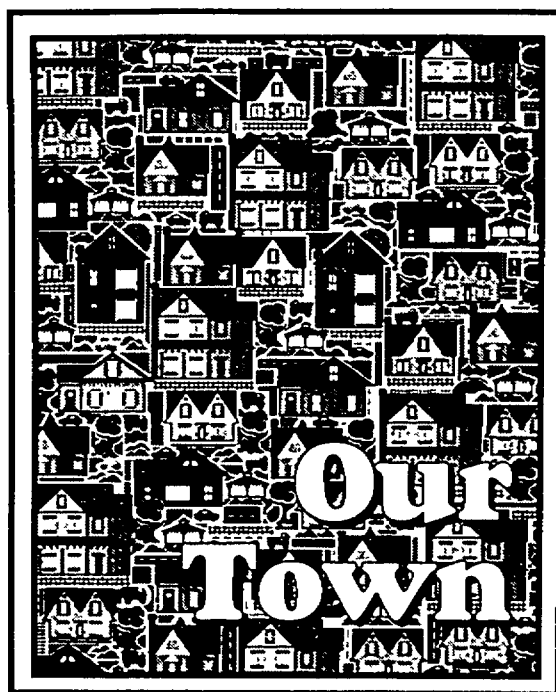

Wooly Bully's to get new look once sale is done

The potential buyer of Wooly Bully's said he planned to get rid of what he called the "appalling" facade of the restaurant if the sale was closed.

Westland resident Ken Mehl said he plans to turn the rock 'n' roll-themed restaurant into a Irish pub, much like the other restaurant he owns, Blarney Bay.

"I have no intention of keeping the motif," Mehl told the township board of trustees. "It's appalling to me."

Mehl said as part of the sale agreement, which is still being negotiated, the owner of Wooly Bully's asked for all of the decorations in and on the building.

Mehl was before the board of trustees Feb. 17 to represent his business in applying for a liquor license transfer from Wooly Bully to his business. The board must approve or deny requests for liquor license transfers.

The sale of the property can't be completed unless the liquor license is approved by the Michigan Liquor Control Commission, Mehl said.

Chip Snider, Northville Township director of public safety, said his department investigated Blar-

ney Bay. "He has an excellent, clean record in Westland," Snider said. "Additionally several of our officers visited his restaurant and found it to be extremely clean and sharp."

The motion to approve the liquor license transfer was approved under the stipulation that Mark Roman, owner of Wooly Bully's, pay \$6,000 he owes for unpaid water bills and \$9,000 he owes for taxes. Roman couldn't be reached for comment.


Since the business just is changing hands, the plans for the new restaurant don't have to go before any governmental township bodies, such as the planning commission.

Mehl said he would try and provide a rendering before any remodeling takes place.

"I don't think we would be remiss in making sure the building fits in with the township plan," said Marv Gans, township board trustee.

Abe Lincoln lives (in Judge Ron Lowe)

Abe Lincoln was at Silver Springs this week for President's Day, honest.

Well, at least an incarnation of Lincoln.

Judge Ron Lowe of 35th District Court, dressed in a felt top hat, black waist coat and beard to tell the students of his, Lincoln's, rise to fame.

Lowe said he has always been a storyteller and Lincoln's life lent itself to the craft.

He told of Lincoln's schooling and the importance of reading in Lincoln's self made curriculum.

"If you added up all of the hours I spent in school it would only equal one and a half years," Lowe told the

students, speaking as Lincoln. "But it was my love of reading and words that helped me grow up to be a lawyer, and eventually president."

The students gasped as he told them of his lack of formal education and marveled at the many different jobs Lincoln had as he made his way to the presidency. They were intrigued by the idea that when the Lincoln family moved across the country everything they owned fit on the backs of two horses.

But the story the students said they most enjoyed was one of Lincoln as a lawyer.

"A man came to me one day saying

he wanted to sue his neighbor for \$2.50," he said.

Once chuckles and disbelief from the students subsided he explained that the man who came to see Lincoln said the man owed him the money and refused to pay. But Lowe-Lincoln said he knew the man who owed the debt had no money. So Lincoln went to the man who wanted to sue and said he'd take the case for \$10, which Lowe explained was a large sum of money in those days. Lincoln then went to the poor man and gave him \$5 explaining he was representing a man who wanted to sue him.

So when they all went to court, the man Lincoln was representing said the poor man owed him money, to which the man agreed and paid him in full.

"So my client got his \$2.50, the poor man paid his debt of \$2.50 and I ended up with \$5.00," he said. "I figured everyone made out all right."

It was that sort of integrity that impressed the young student audience.

"I think it is important to learn about Lincoln. If we didn't we might never know about all the good things he did for people. We'd probably think he was just a president," Kyle

Howley, 11, said.

And Micala Dodson, 10, said it helped to rekindle her curiosity of historical figures.

"I already like to go to the library and look up how people died and how they lived," she said. "This definitely made me want to learn more about him."

Lowe said he enjoyed being able to teach students through stories and knowing that people can learn from the past and that it would impact their futures.

"I think the kids can benefit from learning about Lincoln's sense of responsibility and respect," he said. "Maybe if that learn that now they won't come before me when they are older."

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Block scheduling, seminar period heavily favored by students, staff

The once-controversial seminar and block scheduling system at Northville High School received a whopping 95 percent approval rating from students. In a recent poll.

Principal Tom Johnson presented the results of the semi-annual survey for the three-year-old program at a school board meeting Tuesday.

"When we first began this thing, we had a lot of people vehemently opposed to it," he said. "But now they wouldn't dare let you take it away from them."

The block schedule allows for eight periods in a school day. The first day of the week, students with attend their first through fourth periods. The next day students will go to their fifth through eighth period classes. Those days are designated "A" days and "B" days in an alternating pattern.

It is during the second block, sixth period, when students have seminar. It's an 86-minute period where students are free to go to teachers for extra help, listen to motivational speakers, watch curriculum-related films, or possibly listen to the school music sectional. Johnson pointed out that while students have more freedom with the schedule, there are some restrictions.

"The first 15 minutes of seminar is for the seminar teacher to conduct school business, then students are free to go. However, after about 40 minutes, there is a freeze time where students must stay in the class they are in for the remainder of the seminar period," Johnson said.

A survey was sent to each of the 1,462 students with a return of 1,174. Of those 95 percent said

they would like to see the seminar continue. Some 93 percent of the students surveyed agreed that when they need extra help, they could get it during seminar time. However, only slightly more than three-quarters of students polled said they actually go to teachers during seminar time. A possible reason for that, some students said, is their taking the opportunity to listen to the motivational speakers brought into the school or spend the time doing their homework.

"We're all so busy after school," said senior Brian Tran. "I really like that I can get the majority of my homework done while I'm at school."

However, board member Joan Wadsworth said she was a bit concerned with the number of students who were using the time for homework.

"I think we ought to look at making this time less academic and more enriching," she said.

Johnson said the school is looking into expanding what it offers to students during seminar, but that he was not discouraged by the numbers of students who use their time doing their homework.

"We're continuing to improve on what we have to offer the kids, but I also think it's an incredibly positive way for kids to spend their time," he said. "I think it shows they are making good choices."

The survey also asked students opinions on block scheduling, which received 88 percent approval. In the survey, the numbers showed students were most impressed with the time they said the block schedule gives them to ask questions and discussing topics. And 84 percent of the students said they liked having three or four longer classes rather than six or seven shorter ones.

"I think it's getting us used to the longer lecture classes we will have when we are in college," said junior Kali McCracken.

However, the block schedule earned lower numbers for the amount of group work done in the class (60 percent) and only 56 percent of students agreed that block scheduling allowed them more opportunities to use technology.

Parents and staff were also pleased with the progress students are making under the system. Of the 164 parents surveyed 83 percent of parents agreed that seminar should continue.

A question on the amount of interesting and in-depth work coming from the length of the classes in the block received the lowest numbers from parents with only 44 percent in agreement. In addition, only 46 percent of parents said they agreed that students had a greater sense of community with seminar classes.

However, 90 percent of parents felt that their students were being properly challenged with the academic classes provided by the school. Further, 87 percent of parents surveyed thought taking four classes a day was beneficial to students.

As for staff, 82 percent said they would like to see a continuation of seminar while 89 percent wanted to see the block schedule continue.

Foreign language teacher Emily Serafa said she was firmly against the scheduling change. Her concern, she said, was the idea that students would only be getting their language every other day when language needs to be taught every day to be effective. However, after reconstructing her class, she said the block schedule was indispensable.

Serafa said the scheduling allows her more time for in-depth teaching about culture as well as language. Additionally she was part of the 53 percent of staff who believed the schedule allows for more planning time.

However, while 93 percent of teachers said they believed teaching only three classes a day was beneficial for them, only 83 percent said it was beneficial for students.

Johnson said overall he was very pleased with the results and hoped the program continued to improve. However, he did say the school most likely would not be implementing any major changes to the system due to the move to the new high school in the autumn.

aspects —where the body moves and quality factors — how the body moves.

Motor skill deficiencies show up in any type of child and are easily detectable, Hall said.

"We can see it in their handwriting," she said. "Children who haven't developed their motor skills will have very little upper body strength so they have a hard time controlling their pencils or crayons."

Motor skills such as balance, strength, and agility among others, can be learned, she said.

The program Hall brought in encouraged children to not only be imaginative but also got them moving. For example, the children were asked to link together to create a snowflake tableau.

To do that, a student was told to think of how a snowflake was shaped with points and empty spaces and to recreate that. Another student would then link their shape with the other by using the empty spaces created by

the first student. As more students add to the flake they create a human picture.

"This one helps them with different balance development, imagination, cooperative skills, working together," she said. "It even helps with their vocabulary. Where else would kids this young use the word 'tableau'?"

Hall said they also incorporated literature that is part of their curriculum and use it to initiate some of the dances the children were taught.

"When you get your body moving

as you learn, it helps to store the information better," she said.

However, motor skill development is not relegated just to the classroom, hall said. Parents can play those sorts of imagination and movement games with their children to help them even further. Some examples include Red Light-Green Light, Tag, Hopscotch, and Kickball.

TOWNSHIP SIGNS CONTRACT FOR INPUT OF REAL PROPERTY DATA

The Northville Township board of trustees has approved a contract with Olde Howard and Associates to input the real property data of the township.

Real property data is the major component in the calculations of the township's state equalized valuation and taxable state equalized valuation, which produces the amount of taxes that can be collected within the township.

Real property data has never been inputted into a new computer system the township purchased in 1997. According to a memo from Thelma Kubitskey, township finance director, having staff members input the data would be too expensive.

CHANGE ORDER APPROVED FOR COMMUNITY PARK LIGHTING

The work order for the lighting being added to Northville Community Park has been changed by the Northville Township board of trustees.

The order was changed after it was discovered the cellular tower installed at the park may not be used for athletic field lighting.

The additional light pole would cost \$11,165 if included in the base contract of the project or \$14,234 if awarded at a later date.

As a result, the light pole was added to the base contract.

Northville area Senior Citizens Advisory updates bylaws

The Northville area Senior Citizens Advisory Council has updated its bylaws.

The previously adopted bylaws for the council were approved in 1988. The new bylaws were adopted in an effort to update and streamline the laws.

The updated bylaws must be approved by the township board, Northville City Council and the Northville board of education.

TOWNSHIP VACATES EASEMENT AND ROAD RESTRICTIONS

The Northville Township board of trustees has passed a resolution to vacate the easement and declaration of restrictions for private road construction and maintenance for a piece of land in the township.

The land is located on the east side of Haggerty Road north of Five Mile Road. The land received site plan approval for National Health Lab at the site. However, the building was never constructed so there is no longer a need for the township to have a declaration of restriction for private road construction and maintenance.

STATE ELECTRICAL CODE ADOPTED FOR USE IN NORTHVILLE TOWNSHIP

The Northville Township board of trustees has adopted the state electrical code after the state mandated it do so.

Under new legislation, all communities are required to enforce the state electrical code. Previously, the township could choose

between the state code or one of a number of national codes. Additionally, the township had been using the National Electric Code.

However, the township has been notified that if it doesn't enforce the state code, the state could take over electrical enforcement.

Township approves purchase of GMC meter van for \$23,000

The Northville Township board of trustees has approved the purchase of a new meter van for the department of public services.

The department received approval for the purchase of a vehicle not to exceed \$25,000 in the 2000 budget.

The cost of the truck will be \$23,033 and it will be purchased from Red Holman GMC as the dealer participates in the Oakland County Cooperative Purchasing Program.

ADDITIONAL SIGNAGE APPROVED FOR BONFIRE BISTRO BUILDING

The Northville Township board of trustees approved a request by the owners of Bonfire Bistro to add signs to the building.

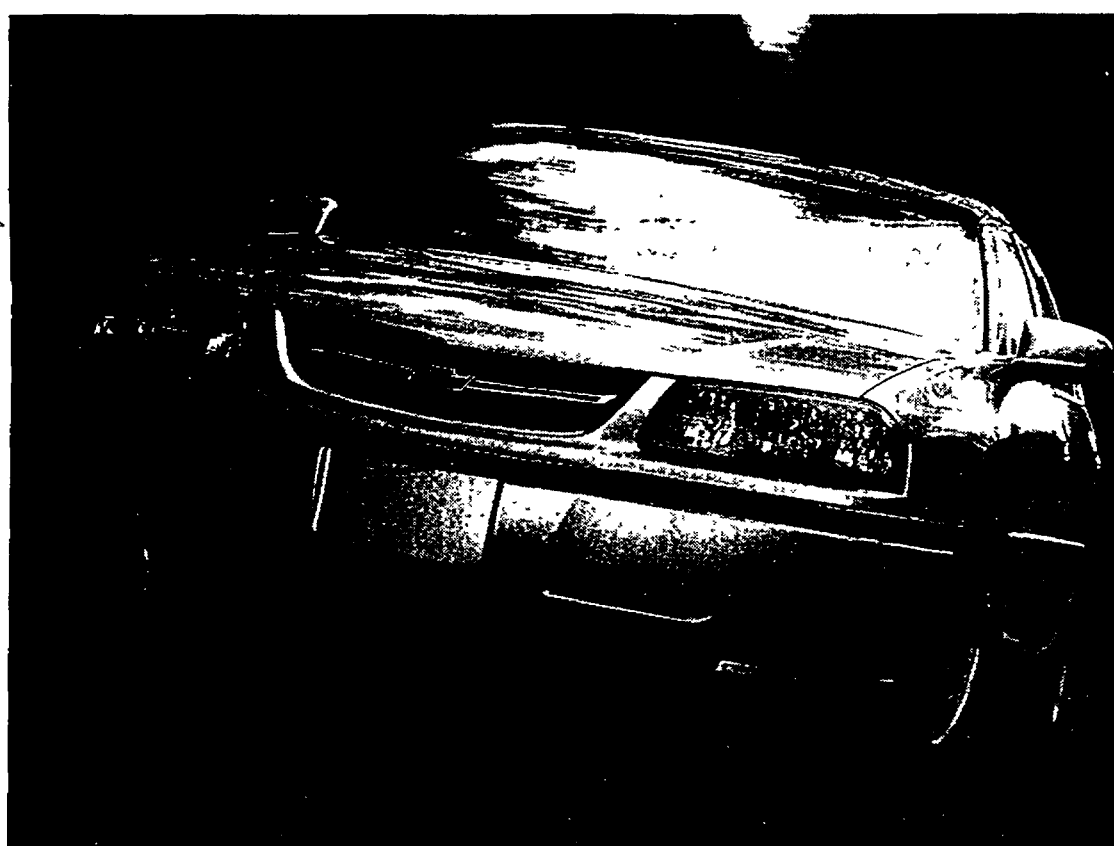

"These pictures are a reflection of who we are as a community. They show us who we are and who we have been," she said.

Many of the original composites, on permanent loan from the Northville Historical Society, are housed in the school board office. Part of the project includes the scanning of the originals into artist Joe Lapinski's computer at Studio One in Farmington Hills. From there, Nield said Lapinski touches up the image by eliminating any water damage or discoloration. He then will fix names and pictures that have faded, leaving the picture like new. It is then stored in a file and a copy is made. The copy is what will be displayed at the new high school, Nield said.

"A lot of people don't want to part with their only original composite," Nield said. "But that's the great part about this project.

We can send them their original and we will always have a copy on the computer and in the high school."

Additionally, Nield said if anything catastrophic should happen at the board office and the originals from the Historical Society were lost, copies would always be available, as well as the ability to make copies for an

alumni who may want one.

"They can be scaled down so if for instance someone was having a class reunion they could be used as name tags or party favors," she said.

Yet the collection is not complete with the missing years including 1913, 1916, 1917, 1920, 1922, 1928, 1956, 1977, 1979, and 1980. However, Nield said over the weekend a member of the class of 1956 heard about the project at a NHS reunion in Florida and offered to donate his copy.

"Many are missing and we are hoping that living members of the graduating classes or family members will be willing help us get the rest of them," Nield said.

Since the project's inception, 22 photos have been sponsored and restored at a cost of \$300 to \$350 per photo. Many of the photos have been adopted by entire classes while

some have were sponsored by civic groups such as Rotary and Kiwanis. Arguably, the most touching may have been the class of 1945, which dedicated its composite to the memory of 17 classmates who died in World War II.

It is the idea that future generations will learn about and appreciate their community forefathers that makes this project so worthwhile, Davis said.

"Anyway that you can keep history alive and show our kids today what life was like in the past it is great and valuable," she said.

Sledding accident has boy's mother concerned

Harley Coleman, spokesman for Wayne County Parks, recreation and forestry said there are designated sledding areas in Hines Park. Those areas are free of obstructions and have gradual slopes, which means people can enjoy relatively safe sledding.

As with anything however, anyone who goes sledding needed to take some precautions, Coleman said. Those include sledding only in designated areas free of fixed obstacles such as trees, fences, posts, and boulders.

He also said children younger than 12 should wear a protective helmet. Additionally, if the child chooses to wear a bicycling helmet, which is acceptable, he should wear a knit cap underneath top preserve body heat. Coleman also said children and adults should avoid sledding in a head-first position. Instead, the sledder should sit upright and steer with his or her feet, and that people should avoid sledding on plastic sheets, since they can be pierced by sharp objects and cannot be steered. Sleds with runners are preferable to toboggans or saucers, which have no steering mechanism, he said.

Schlicker said she just hoped more parents attempt to find out how to keep their kids safe on the sledding slopes.


"I don't think parents should stop kids from sledding. It's a nice clean sport but I think they should be aware of what can happen," he said.



GOP primary proves it: one vote can tip the scales

Think your vote doesn't count? Guess again. And it's not just talk any-

more. The proof, as they say, is in the pudding, or in this case the Feb. 22 Republican primary.

Here's how close it was: 2,093 votes for Texas Gov. George W. Bush and 1,978 for Arizona Sen. John McCain in Northville Township. A difference of 115 votes.

In the city, it was 739 votes for McCain and 682 for Bush. A difference of 57 votes.

That's a difference of 172 people contributing to the decision of who may be our country's next leader. Still not impressed? Think of it as a crowded store at Christmas time or a busy restaurant at 6 p.m. on a Friday evening.

Someone may say, "Big deal. Whoever wins in the Northville area isn't going to make or break the election for either party."

That may be true in part — after all, no candidates felt it necessary to make an appearance here.

But think of how many other Northville areas are out there. From Copper Harbor to Monroe, the small to midsize communities add up. Why else would McCain bother to

make stops in places like Canton and Brighton? Because they want your vote.

Voting itself can be a great way to make a sort of anonymous statement too, which some are saying was another byproduct of the recent Republican primary.

For example, some say when Gov. John Engler made comments about Michigan being a "firewall" for the Bush campaign, he motivated a lot of Democrats, Independents and

angry Republicans to prove him wrong. It's not often the "little man" can file a "complaint" that gets heard at the top level.

Perhaps more people would turn out for all elections if instead of calling them voting booths they were called complaint boxes.

So the campaign trail leaves Michigan and heads off to

North Dakota, Virginia and Washington where who knows what will happen?

Just about one thing is certain though: Michigan has spoken and will be heard for the campaign.

To those voters who decided to "speak," congratulations on making the Democratic process fresh and exciting again.

And if you think your vote doesn't count, guess again.

Think of how many other Northville areas out there. From Copper Harbor to Monroe, the small to midsize communities add up. Why else would McCain bother to make stops in places like Canton and Brighton?

Wooly Bullys conversion best with less government

Appaling? Probably not. Out of step with the character of the surrounding community? Probably so.

That's what we think about the appearance of Northville Township's Wooly Bullys, the rock 'n' roll diner apparently headed for a sale to Westland resident Ken Mehl, who wants to turn the business into a traditional Irish pub.

Almost from Day One, residents had their opinions on the eatery-bar-dance spot at Seven Mile and Northville roads. Some loved it, some hated it, but no matter who you were or what your love or contempt for Elvis and Company was, there was little doubt that Wooly Bullys was cut from a different cloth.

The business' eye-catching motif has been a double-edged sword. It can hardly be debated that giant guitars and front ends of cars darting out from walls turns heads. And since rock 'n' roll has always been about going outside of the lines and breaking the rules, Wooly Bullys has stayed faithful to the "rebel without a cause" spirit of rock.

But try blending that facade into a community more known for Victorian homes and quaint shops only a mile down the road, and it's little wonder why others shake their head when they see Wooly Bullys. For them, it just deviates too much from what they expect to see near the

Northville Township-Northville city limits.

The township's board of trustees has hinted at wanting to see plans for whatever renovations Mr. Mehl wanted to bring to Wooly Bullys once the deal is done. Since what's happening is simply a transfer in ownership, a review by the township's planning commission isn't technically necessary.

Nor should it be. Checks by the township's public safety department have shown Mr. Mehl to be a responsible businessman in Westland. That, coupled with the professional manner in which Mr. Mehl has dealt with the board to this point should provide enough evidence to suggest that he'll provide an exterior design more in step with "traditional"

Northville. Adding unnecessary governmental interference into the mix, we fear, would only take a bite out of creative license and slow down Mr. Mehl's ability to get rolling on his project.

Furthermore, since Wooly Bullys is already bound by parking lots, railroad tracks and Seven Mile Road, it isn't as if there are trees or wetlands to take into consideration.

The township's keeping a finger on the pulse of Wooly Bullys' transformation is legitimate and responsible. Getting two hands in there is a different story altogether.

Look to Engler to solve farm tax snafu

One of the largest contributors to "sprawl" — low density, uncontrolled, wholesale development, often in rural areas — is a perverse part of the Michigan tax code that requires land to be assessed at its "highest and best use." In practice, this means that rural land that has been farmed for years is often assessed as though it were going to be sold for residential development tomorrow.

This has saddled Michigan farmers, already facing the worst economic times in a decade, with unfairly high taxes that can force them to sell their land and quit farming. Result? Development; sometimes sprawling.

This is not a problem encountered by only a few agricultural malcontents. Over the past 15 years, something like 1.2 million acres of farmland has gone out of production in Michigan, a not insubstantial blow to agriculture, at \$4 billion per year the second largest industry in Michigan.

Of all politicians presently on the scene, Gov. John Engler, who grew up on a farm, is the best qualified to address this problem.

In a plan announced last week at the Michigan Farm Bureau convention, Engler proposed:

- Farmland would be assessed on the land's present economic value for farming, not on its potential value if developed.
- Enacting this proposal would require amending the Michigan Constitution, and so would need a two-thirds vote in the Legislature to get on the statewide ballot.
- If farmland under production but with reduced taxes were to be sold for development,

the selling farmer would pay back the tax break he had received for the past seven years.

This money would go into an Agricultural Preservation Fund, to be used to buy development rights from farmers willing to sell them. In effect, farmers who choose to sell development rights would continue to own and farm their land, but would have sold off the option of developing it.

A key part of the plan is repayment of the tax break if farmland is developed. Otherwise, all the tax break would do is encourage land speculation schemes.

In some states where farmland is taxed at a reduced rate, developers reap the tax break for themselves by renting land to farmers, thereby reducing the carrying cost of land fated for ultimate development.

As is the case with most sensible proposals, Engler's farmland preservation proposal has a cost. Taxing agricultural land at its actual

value as a farm would cost state and local governments something like \$90 million each year. The Senate Fiscal Agency estimates that local governments and school districts would be hardest hit, absorbing \$67 million of the reduced revenue stream.

And you may expect to hear from various folks — the Michigan Townships Association in first place — who consider their particular ox a target for goring.

Others, however, are saner in their reactions. "It's a good way to go," said a spokesman for the Farm Bureau. "Sprawl ends up paying to protect farmland."

And Lee Schwarz, a lobbyist for the Michigan Association of Homebuilders, argues the program would save farmland by making farming profitable. "It's idiotic to tax farmland as though you were building condominiums on it," he says.

At the end of the day it's plain that serious distortions in land use have arisen from the ways in which agricultural land in Michigan is assessed. Right now, all the incentives favor converting perfectly productive farmland into subdivisions.

Engler's proposal deserves passage by the Legislature and adoption by the voters of Michigan.

The naked truth of adult entertainment

House speaker Chuck Perricone was nervous when he unveiled a new plan for regulating "adult entertainment" establishments last fall.

He was not concerned with how those in the industry or free speech advocates would respond. It was the reaction of other conservatives and local officials that had him worried.

Licensing adult book stores, massage parlors and strip clubs, Perricone took pains to explain, does not equate to condoning them.

Because prohibitions haven't worked, because zoning restrictions aimed limiting their numbers and restricting their locations haven't worked, Perricone was proposing a system of licensing.

Issuing licenses would give the state, and along with it municipalities, an additional measure of control. If a porn shop became a nuisance in a community, revocation of the license would give the government an additional tool in attempting to bring it into compliance.

It turns out, that approach may have more benefits than expected.

Rep. Mike Bishop, R-Rochester, says the members of his Committee on Constitutional Law and Ethics are getting quite an education.

The committee is conducting a series of hearings on the 12-bill package in preparation for sending it to the House for a vote in a few weeks. Besides Bishop, local lawmakers sponsoring portions of the package include Reps. Eileen DeHart, D-Westland, Susan Tabor, R-Delta Township, and Laura Toy, R-Livonia.

It turns out, that "adult entertainment" is not just good clean, if ribald, fun, as the owners of the establishments would have you believe it is. In fact, it's pretty disgusting.

For one, the facilities themselves are often unsanitary, with multiple health code violations. And if crime seems to be attracted to the vicinity of porn shops, it may be because the owners encourage it, Bishop said.

For another, the adult industry exploits the people, the women, who work in it. An example is "Susan," not her real name, who lives in the Flint area. Bishop allowed her to testify anonymously before the committee recently.

Tossed out of the house by her father at age 14, Susan was taken under wing by the folks who run a local "gentlemen's club." She was quickly put to work as a dancer, paid under the table. Along with tips, all that unreported income was pretty attractive.

But what started out as a helping hand quickly became exploitative as she got addicted, not just to drugs but to "the lifestyle" and "various forms of promiscuity."

Now 18 and out of the industry, Susan is speaking out because she still has friends trapped in the lifestyle.

What allowed her to be taken advantage of in that manner, Bishop argues, is the fact adult establishments often do not count their dancers or "massagists" as employees. They're paid on the side, in cash, so W-2s aren't issued to them.

Often, the committee has also learned, those dancers and massagists — who may make hundreds of dollars a day — are also able to collect welfare because all that income goes unreported, Bishop said.

Licensing begins to address that, he said. The law will have to be written to clarify that dancers and massagists are indeed employees, their pay has to be reported and W-2s must be issued.

When they are hired, they'll have to give their Social Security numbers and confidential information so that taxes can be paid.

In doing so, it will be quite clear to the owners of these establishments whether their employees are of legal age, Bishop concluded. And if the owners don't get the information, or their employees aren't old enough, the licenses will then be in jeopardy.

Those who disapprove of porn shops may be uncomfortable with the solution. But it would seem we are going to have "adult entertainment," anyway. Attempts to ban it haven't worked. And the controls communities have tried to place on them have been ineffective.

Licensing might just get rid of the worst of the abuses found in that industry.

Newspaper staff doesn't know it all

Engler has done much good for Detroit

To the editor:
A column by Mike Malott has recently come to my attention in which he criticized what he called a disturbing "pattern" of singling out the city of Detroit for "uncomfortable reforms" by state legislators and Governor Engler.

Gov. Engler and state lawmakers have singled out Detroit often, but contrary to what Mr. Malott suspects, this unique attention has been given in the interests of helping the city. Thanks to the changes with Detroit's school system, a strong focus has been put on removing many of the obstacles to a quality education that exist for students in the district.

There are many examples of how state government has provided special attention to Michigan's largest city during Gov. Engler's tenure. Last winter, in the wake of

a major storm, the state provided snowplowing assistance within Detroit's city limits. The state also played a major role in infrastructure development for the Tigers' new home, Comerica Park, which will open in April.

At the end of the 1998 legislative session, lawmakers protected Detroit from the possibility of losing certain benefits as a result of the 2000 census by lowering the trigger point in many laws from a population of 1 million to 750,000. This was done solely on Detroit's behalf. In addition, the state has provided extraordinary funding levels for the city's cultural gems like the DIA, DSO and Museum of African American History.

The list goes on. In 1997, the state opened a Department of Environmental Quality office in Detroit to focus on ensuring that

the city's environment is clean and safe. Two years before that, the governor declared that the State Fair would stay in Detroit rather than move elsewhere, and the state absorbed the Fair's financial deficit. Mayor Archer has also recognized the governor's efforts to preserve Detroit's level of state revenue sharing dollars.

The state is not attempting to undermine Detroit with its initiatives but to assist in the city's renaissance and Gov. Engler will continue to work with the legislature to provide that assistance because it is the right thing to do. I hope in the future, Mr. Malott will recognize these efforts for what they are rather than misinterpret them.

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Wrong fork can spell disaster

"The world was my oyster, but I chose the wrong fork."
— Oscar Wilde

I am sure that when Mr. Wilde uttered those words, he was speaking generally — figuratively rather than literally. Yet, in our modern world, choosing the wrong fork literally is a problem most people seem to have. In fact, mention the word "etiquette" to anyone and the first thing they will think is "What fork do I use?"

Choosing the wrong fork could be more than an embarrassing when you want to make a good impression, such as when hosting a dinner party, when entertaining a special client or customer, when dining at a gala affair or even out on a first date.

According to a survey, the executives of the Fortune 500 companies stated they considered poor table manners an immediate turn-off. It was also found that only 12 percent of the young newly-hired employees had any knowledge of proper table manners. That's only 12 people out of 100. So that is why more and more companies are now interviewing their prospective employees over a dining table — especially if those employees are going to be representing their companies publicly by entertaining clients or business associates. As you can imagine, there is enough pressure in the interview itself without the added tension of wondering how to handle the forest of silverware and the army of glassware sitting in front of you.

Therefore, I have added dining etiquette to almost all of the seminars I conduct, whether it be for children, women's groups, corporate business executive and managers, teens or those who simply want to know how to host a dinner party.

Speaking of forks and silverware,

outside of the cupped hand, the oldest of all eating utensils is the spoon. The first ones used by cave-men were probably long straight sticks. When people began to cook and boil their food, I imagine some enterprising woman asked her Neanderthal mate to please use a thicker piece of wood and carve a scoop at one end to hold liquid.

In their journal during their 1804 expedition into the American northwest wilderness, Lewis and Clark wrote how they ate buffalo and pemmican with potatoes, using spoons fashioned out of animal horns by their Sioux Indian hosts. Eons later, they were made from metal and were fish-shaped. It wasn't until the 17th century that they were made in the elliptical shape we have today. Spoons are the easiest and safest implement to use and is the one babies use first.

Knives, in one form or another, have been around for centuries and through the years have been used for various purposes — sharpening pencils, splitting firewood, whittling wooden objects, cutting one's fingernails, and at times, settling scores with one's enemies. It was also used for conveying food into the mouth by either piercing it with the knife tip or balancing it on the blade. This must have been tricky to do as at first, both sides of the blade had

sharp cutting edges. It wasn't until 1669 in France that dinner knives were reduced to only one cutting edge and the point was rounded off mainly because it was not only being used as a toothpick but to discourage assassinations at meals as well. It became illegal for cutlery to make pointed dinner knives or for innkeepers to lay them out on their tables. Recently, pointed knives are again used at the dinner table but only as "steak" knives and is the only food for which it should be used.

And then came the fork — that utterly strange new implement that was used not only to hold food still while it was being cut, but to transport it into the mouth. According to research, the first we read of a modern fork was in the early 11th century when the Greek-born wife of a rich Venetian Doge insisted on eating with a fork, which at the time was an unheard-of innovation. This brought the wrath of the church down on her head and when she became ill and died, it was deemed a divine punishment for the worldly arrogance displayed by her tableware and was God's retribution against her uppityness because she (oh, my!) ate with a fork. What's more, the woman also took an occasional bath in fresh water. No wonder God struck her down. (Conveniently, it was not mentioned that she and many hundreds perished during the plague.)

Nevertheless, it was more than 300 years later that we read of forks again and another 200 years were to pass before the fork was accepted and used for eating. Even when it was introduced to the English in 1608 by a gentleman who saw it in Italy and brought back the custom to his own home, he was ridiculed about using it.

In 1335, Edward I standardized

the silver/alloy content and called it sterling. English silver was very prestigious and is considered the "queen of metals." In 1743 in Sheffield, England, silver plating began. Today silver is electroplated. With the invention of stainless steel in the 1920s, we have more choices of affordable dinnerware. If your choice is silver, be sure to wash silver promptly after each meal so food does not tarnish it. Wash in hot, soapy water using a soft cloth or brush. Rinse well in hot, clean water and dry promptly with a soft clean cloth. Polish occasionally rubbing lengthwise and again, wash in hot, soapy water, rinse well and dry with a soft clean cloth.

Use your good silver often — it will outlive you.

Now that you know a bit of the background on silverware, let me end with this quote from Judith Martin (Miss Manners):

"Etiquette should not be perceived as just simply rules for perks rather than as guidelines for living."

"Because it was my first novel," Ephron says, "I wanted to be on safe ground, so I used my relationship with my father as the core of the book."

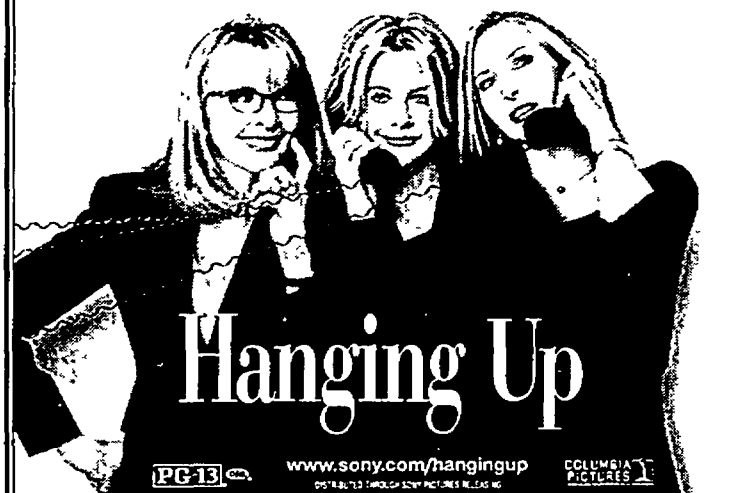

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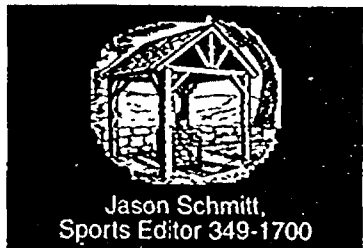

The Mustangs had little trouble trouncing Walled Lake 141.05-102.25 last Wednesday, but found it within themselves to perform brilliantly. The gymnasts swept every event, scoring a 9.0 or better seven times. Monica Fink posted career highs on both the floor exercise and in the all-around competition.

The team will gear up for the conference meet today before heading off to regionals a week from Saturday (March 4).

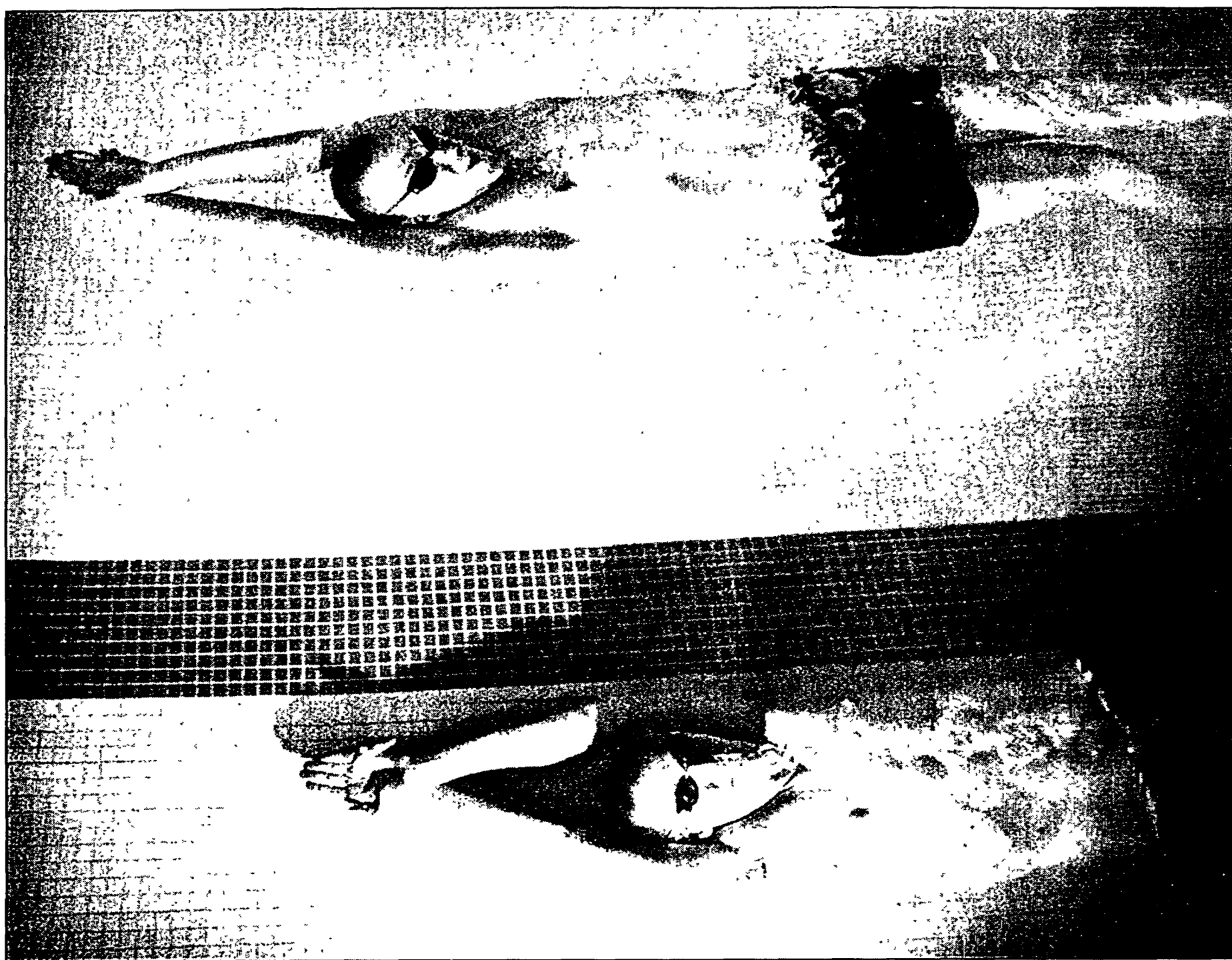

It's not that often that twins are born, one in 40 or 45 to be exact.

That was until LaRiche scored shorthanded just 23 seconds into the third period to tie the

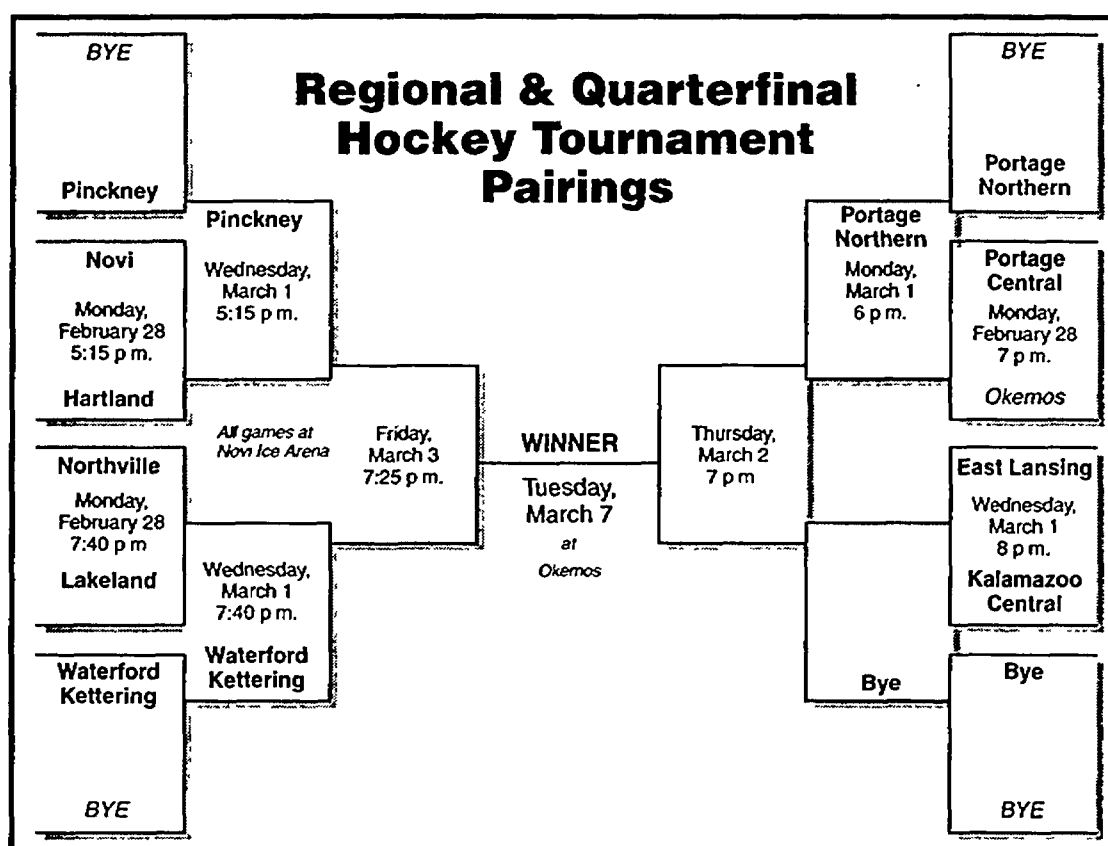
score at 2-2. Northville then took a 3-2 lead just 1:24 later on a goal by Hillebrand, assisted by Stewart.

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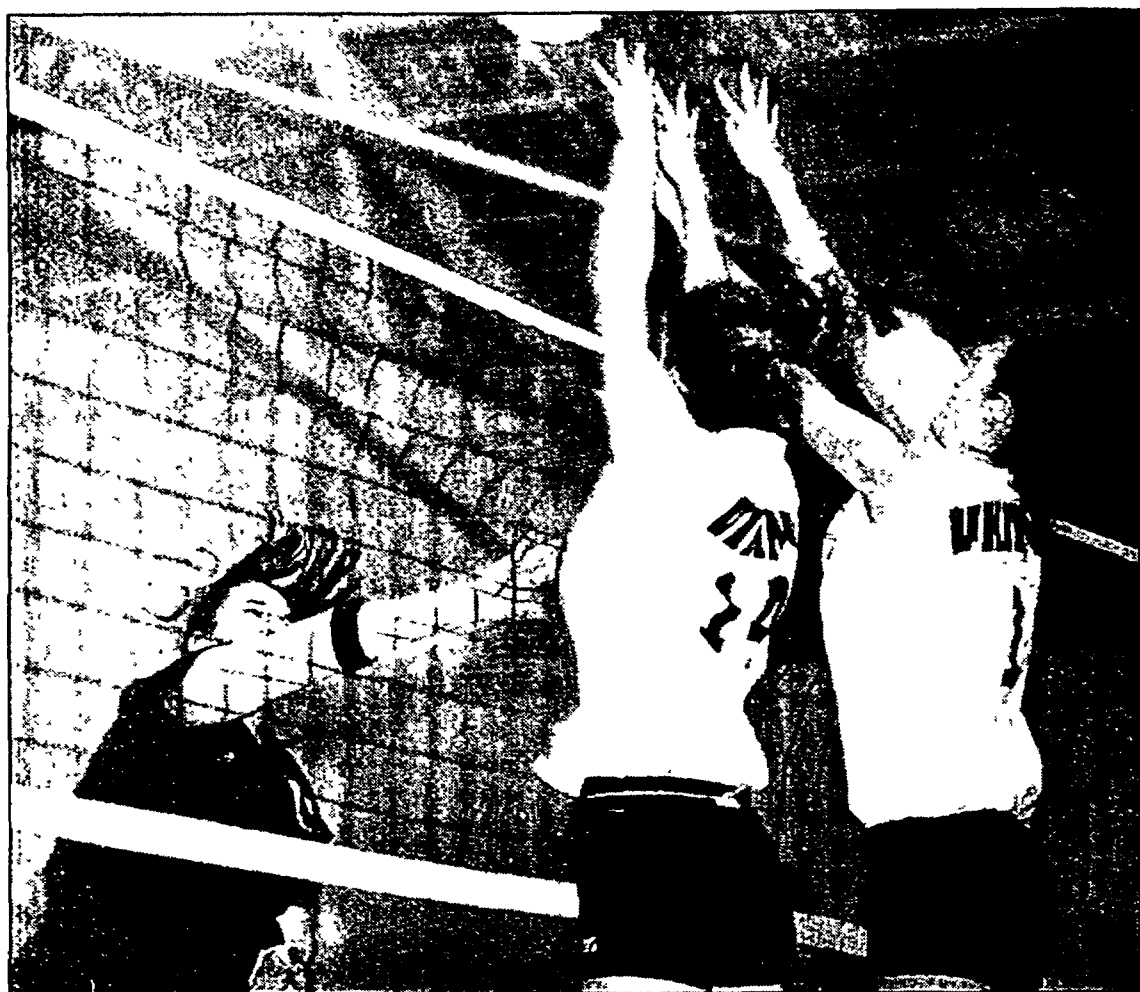

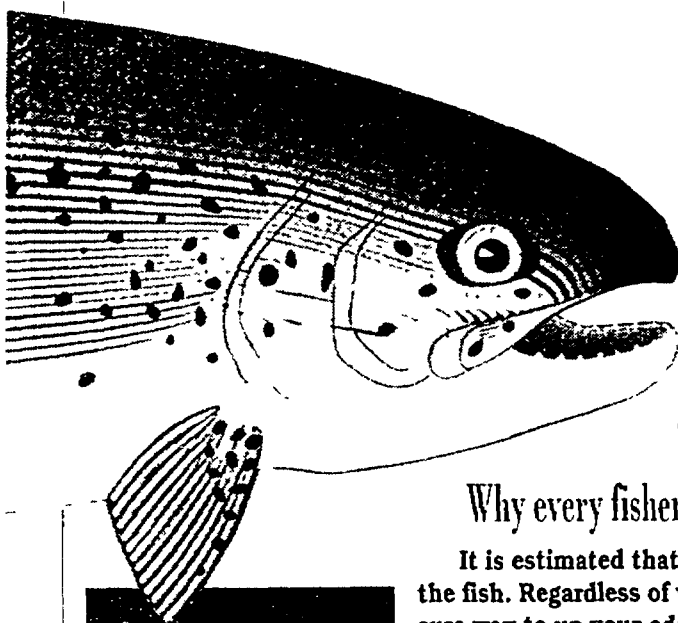
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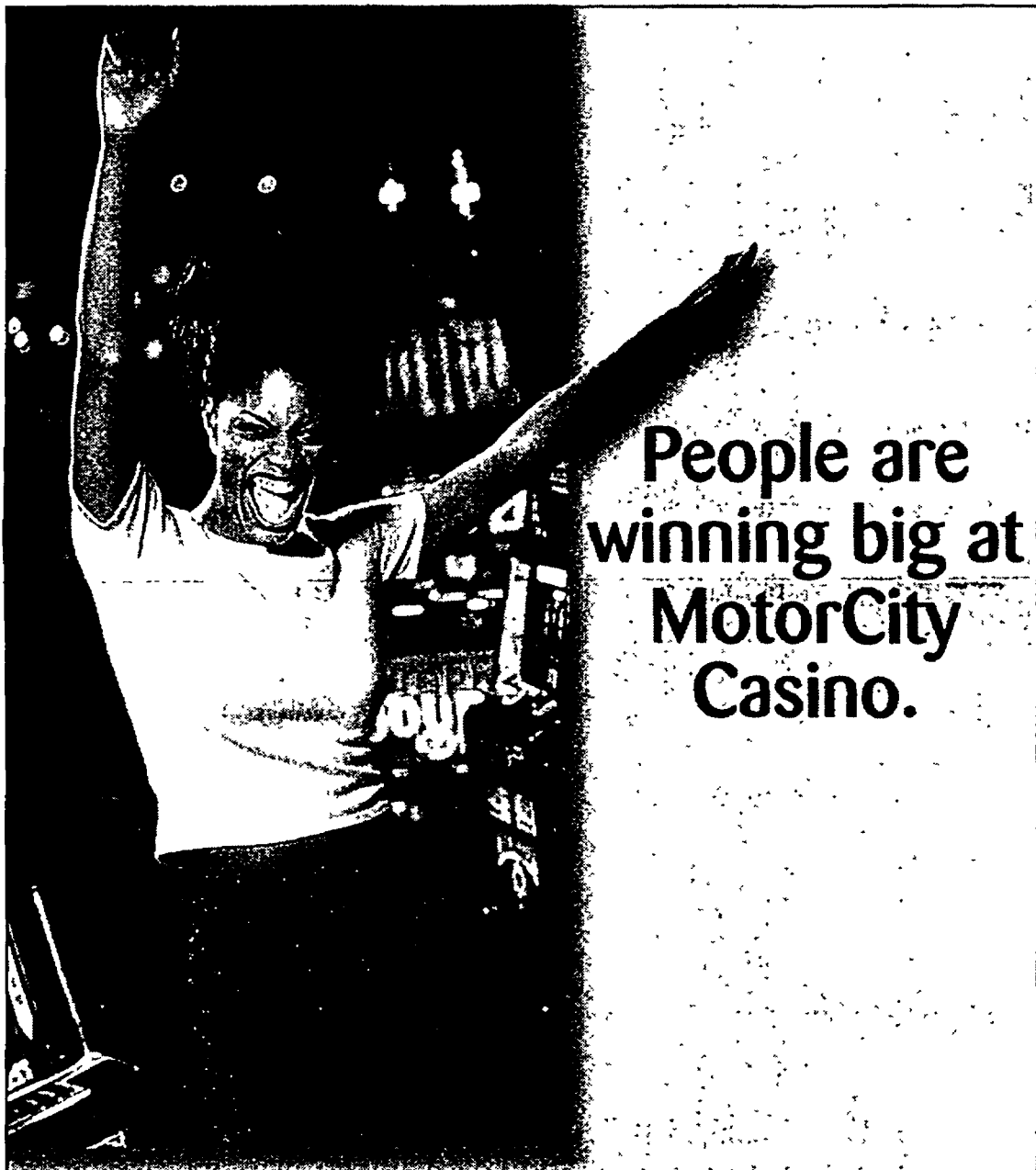

Too much sugar sours American diet

Americans' obsession with lowering their fat intake has created another nutrition concern: too much sugar.

The typical person munches a hefty 20 teaspoons of sugar a day - enough to bake about 100 banana cream pies a year.

"Americans are consuming twice the amount of sugar that is recommended," said Dr. Kathy Goldberg, dietitian at the University of Michigan Health System. "The amount of sugar in our diets has increased significantly over the last 20 years."

Excess sugar can lead to a whole host of problems aside from just tooth decay: obesity, diabetes, hyperlipidemia, and malnutrition are potential risks.

"Too much sugar tends to crowd out other nutritious food from our diet, such as whole grains, fruits and vegetables, and low-fat dairy foods," said Goldberg. "A particular concern is that children have small stomachs. Having too many of their calories from sugar crowds out other nutritious foods from their diet. When they're filling up on sugar, that's excess calories

that can lead to obesity. Obesity in itself can lead to heart disease, diabetes, hypertension and some forms of cancer."

Sugar also occurs naturally in a lot of food. Dairy foods are very high in a sugar called lactose and fruits are very high in a sugar called fructose. But, those sugars occur naturally along with the fiber, vitamins and minerals that our bodies need. These nutrients fortify our bodies against heart disease, osteoporosis, stroke and some cancers.

In 1996, an average 29.3 percent of American adults were obese, compared to 32 percent of Michigan's adults. The Michigan Department of Community Health expects that rate to rise to as high as 37 percent by this year.

It is not hard to eat that much sugar. A single serving of most fruit yogurts contains about 70 percent of the USDA's recommended daily allowance of sugar. A single 12-ounce Pepsi contains 103 percent, a Cinnabon about 123 percent, and a Dairy Queen Mr. Misty Slush, a whopping 280 percent of the recommended daily allowance of sugar. Soft drinks are the No. 1 culprit of added

sugar in our diet.

This year, make a promise to yourself to eat a healthier, balanced diet. An occasional sweet treat is fine, but just don't make it a substitute for healthy, nutritious, good foods.

- Watch for sugar and its many aliases: brown sugar, confectioner's sugar, corn sweeteners, corn syrup, dextrose, fructose, galactose, glucose, honey, invert sugar, lactose, levulose, maltitol, marmalitol, sorbitol, xylitol, maltose, maple sugar, molasses, raw sugar, and sucrose.

- Limit sugar to 10 percent of your day's calories, according to recommendations issued by the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

- Avoid sticky, sweet foods.

- Limit soft drinks.

- Read labels looking for sugar in the ingredients list.

- Use more spices in lieu of sugar. Cinnamon, vanilla, spearmint and anise provide a sweet taste to food without adding sugar to calories.

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HOW TO

Ivy removal can drive homeowners up the wall

9. I removed ivy from a portion of brick walls on my house. Although the brick was subsequently scraped and sanded, a considerable number of ivy root stubs remain on the brick. I still have a section of brick with remaining ivy that I want to remove. Do you know how I can remove ivy and the remaining ivy root stubs without damaging the brick, perhaps with a chemical solution or by power washing?

A. Removal of ivy rooted into masonry is a difficult task. The ivy is held in place by tiny but tough hairlike tendrils. These tendrils invade every available crack and cranny, and they are almost impossible to pry out, especially on masonry walls. In addition, water can penetrate into the tiny cracks that have been formed by these tendrils, causing even further damage, especially in geographical areas that experience a freeze-thaw cycle.

In the removal of ivy, you should avoid pulling the vines away from the wall, since this can loosen masonry units. Instead, cut away a few square feet from an inconspicuous area and determine how much it may have rooted into the brickwork. If the vines are too firmly rooted, you may decide it's not worth the effort.

However, if you decide to continue, proceed by cutting apart the bulk of the vine using pruning shears. Use a good pair of gloves to avoid injuring your hands as you pull the sheared vine away from the wall. Once the

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Collector can clean up with vintage washer

Q. I have enclosed a photo of an old hand-crank washing machine that I bought about five years ago at a garage sale. The tub is galvanized, and the gears are cast iron. Overall, it is in mint condition.

I'm just wondering if you could give me a little information on it and its value?

A. An entire day used to be set aside to do the family laundry. For most homemakers, Monday was wash day. First, soiled clothes had to soak to help remove stains. Then copper, galvanized metal or tin boilers were filled with hot water, and clothes were washed with lye soap. Many women had to make their own soap out of lye and lard. Wash sticks, pounders and washboards were used to help remove dirt. Bluing was added to rinse water to keep clothes from looking dingy. Starch had to be prepared for items that had to be crisp. After all that, everything had to be hung up to dry. Tuesday mornings, homemakers were faced with clean but stiff and wrinkled clothes, thus making Tuesday ironing day.

The type of washing machine that you have was a welcomed improvement over the metal boiler and washboard method. Your circa 1900 washing machine would prob-

bly be worth about \$175 to \$250.

Q. Enclosed is the mark that is on the bottom of our chocolate pot. The pot is decorated with a design of leaves, flowers and berries all in shades of brown against a white background. Lehner's Encyclopedia of U.S. Marks on Pottery, Porcelain and Clay lists the mark as one used by Burroughs and Mountford Co. in Trenton, N.J.

Could you please give us an idea of the value of our chocolate pot?

A. Burroughs and Mountford Co. produced white granite and cream-colored wares from 1879 to 1882. Your chocolate pot would probably be worth about \$125 to \$175.

Q. I recently purchased two framed prints by Bessie Pease Gutmann at an antiques shop. One was \$30, and the other was \$15. Since then, I learned that similar prints are available at hobby stores.

I would like to know the history of these prints.

A. Bessie Pease Gutmann was an extremely successful artist who painted irresistible babies and children. Her paintings were reproduced as framed pictures, on calendars and postcards. In magazines and books. In the 1920s and 1930s, just about every household had a Pease Gutmann print hanging on the wall. Most of her prints were signed, usually in the lower left or right corner. Titles appeared centered and just below the subject

matter. A stock number and the publisher's

name were also included on the matting or below the image.

Collectors should be on the lookout for the recent reproductions that are on the market today. They typically have no title or publisher's name and are of no value as collectibles.

An original print would probably be worth about \$125 to \$225.

Q. We have a child's sewing machine that was made by the Singer Manufacturing Company in 1926. It is in perfect working condition. We still have the original cardboard box and instructions.

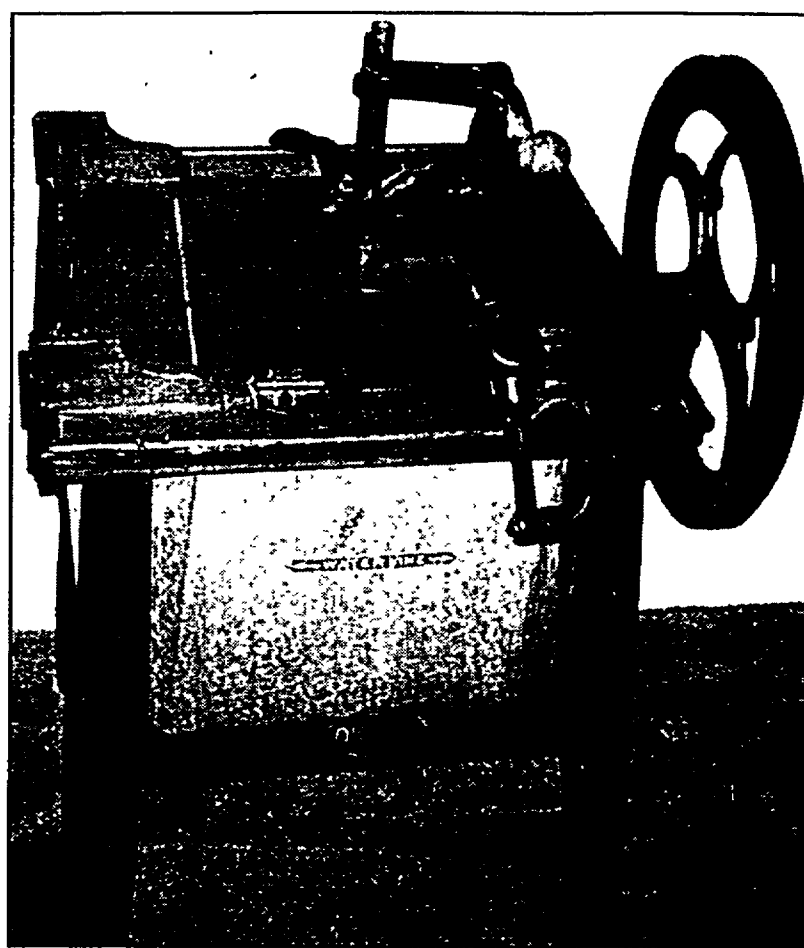
Do you have any idea of its value?

A. Sewing-related items, from thimbles to sewing machines, are enthusiastically collected. Much misinformation is swirling around out there. Collectors should do research and ask questions. Age and condition define value and desirability. Remember, a patent date shows the year the piece was patented, not the year of manufacture. Items that are repaired weigh in at around 60 percent to 80 percent less than those in mint condition.

Your early 1900s child's sewing machine would probably be worth about \$225 to \$250.

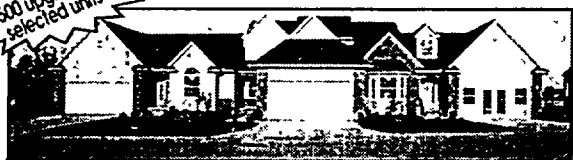

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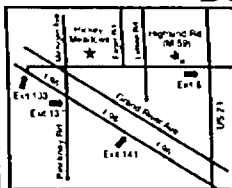

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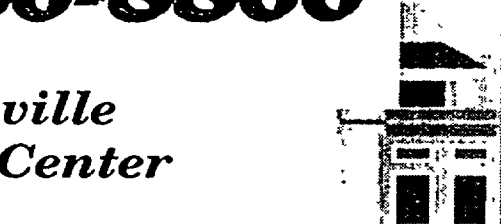

vines have been removed, you will have deposits left on the wall, which are the suckers that attached the vines. They should be left alone for two or three weeks, until they dry up and turn dark.

They can then be removed with a stiff brush and laundry detergent or a diluted solution of trisodium phosphate. Do not use harsh chemicals or acids, which tend to do more damage to the wall than the plant remnants. A warning: If the suckers are left alone too long, they will rot and oxidize, becoming very hard and nearly impossible to remove without damaging the masonry surface.

Another method of removal is to attack the tendrils as soon as the vines have been cut away. Use a small portable propane torch to burn off the tips of the tendrils and get rid of all vegetation. Brush away any remaining residue with a stiff bristle brush (do not use a wire brush, which can cause rust stains). Remember to keep a hose and spray nozzle handy when working with the flame. Immediately spray down any surface that is hit with the flame.

On wood surfaces, you can use a paint scraper or wire brush to remove the tendrils that cling to the smooth surface. Take special care if you decide to burn off the tendrils from wood siding. If staining from the tendrils remains, you can use a product developed for stripping paint and graffiti from masonry surfaces.

Sure Klean Heavy Duty Paint Stripper is effective in removing stains left from vines or foliage growing on masonry surfaces (do not use on wood). Apply and let set for 12 hours or overnight. Pressure rinse with the appropriate

For homeowners considering growing vines up the side of the house, protect your home by planting them so that they grow up a trellis. That way, air can circulate around them (eliminating moisture problems) and you can control their growth. Otherwise vines can cause major damage to both siding and masonry surfaces as well as your roofing.

9. I am confused about lumber grading. What standards do the different gradings represent, and what should I look for? I am planning some knotty-pine cabinet work. This is not a particularly fancy project, but I would like to be sure I have a long-lasting product.

A. Lumber grading is very confusing, even to the experienced carpenter. More important than the grading system is a thorough inspection of wood you plan to use. If you hand pick each piece, you can avoid permanent discoloration and staining, excessive knots, cracking, etc.

If a lumberyard won't let you do this, then take your business elsewhere. The important thing is to get the quality of wood you want at a price you are willing to pay, regardless of how the wood is graded.

Size - Jetted tubs may be the size of a standard bathtub (60" L x 32" W) or large enough to accommodate two or more people.

Jets - Adjustable jets are often accompanied by specific-point jet options, such as lumbar and foot jets.

Hot Water Requirements - According to the National Kitchen and Bath Association, the capacity of your water heater should be at least two-thirds the capacity of the tub. For example, a 40 gallon water heater will serve a 60 gallon tub adequately. In-line heaters are available in most models if your water heater is not large enough.

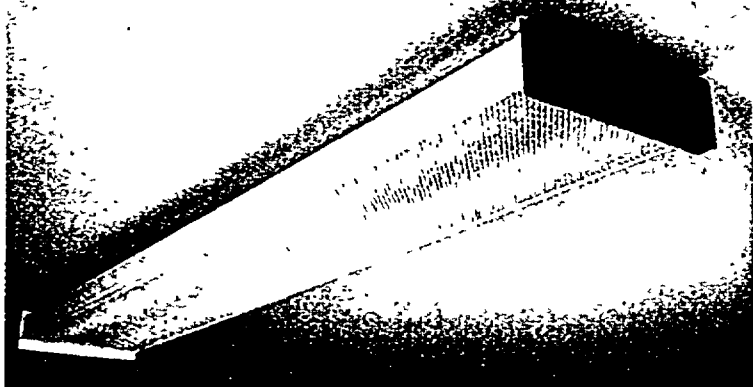


Lighting Up Your Kitchen

Think of your kitchen as a whole room, but with separate functional areas. These include: over the sink, over the range, over an island or in an eating area. Each individual area should be independently lit.

To light the entire kitchen with one light source, use a light fixture bright enough for general lighting. For general lighting, a decorative fluorescent fixture or recessed lights evenly spaced on 6' centers would provide adequate light levels for everyday functions. To light the other spaces, use a combination of task and accent lighting. For accent lighting, consider halogen light kits or cable lights to provide a warm atmosphere as well as show off the details of your kitchen you enjoy the most.

For specific task areas use track lighting in overhead areas or fluorescent undercabinet lights to provide a brighter source for cleaning and reading. Always try to avoid placing fixtures where you may create shadows.



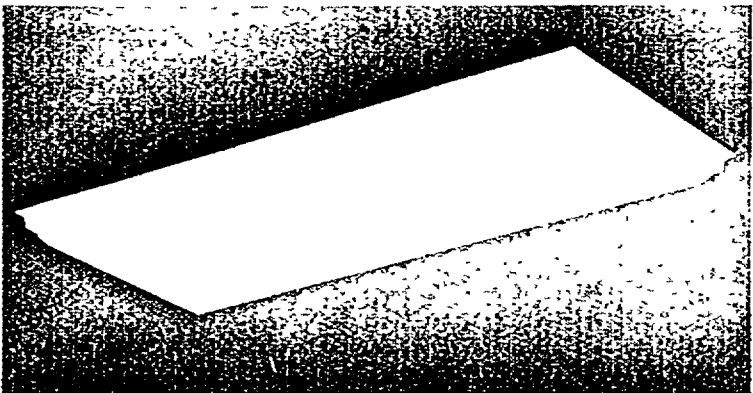
