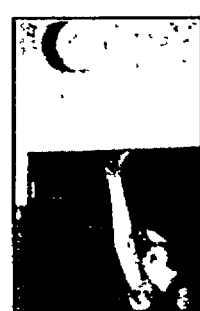

Ex-con arraigned on gun charges

A Northville Township man convicted of criminal sexual conduct faces five years in prison and/or a \$5,000 fine for alleged illegal possession of a firearm.

Steven Smith, 41, 19800 Maxwell Road, was arraigned March 16 on the charge of a felon possessing a firearm. He faces up to five years in prison and/or a \$5,000 fine in connection with the charge.

Township police found a .308 assault rifle with 3,000 rounds of ammunition in the man's house after it was searched in connection with a drug-related charge.

"Police responded to his house on a cocaine overdose of someone who didn't live there," said Detective Paul Sumner, Northville Township police, in 35th District Court. "Inside the house police saw several narcotics and drug paraphernalia items in the open. A search warrant was obtained and the subsequent search of the home turned up the weapon and ammunition."

Sumner later said police later learned that two 22-year-old women in the home were watching the house for Smith. They admitted to smoking marijuana and crack cocaine and were charged on separate drug counts.

Possession of a .308 assault rifle is not illegal. However, police further investigated the incident and discovered the man was a convicted felon on probation for second degree criminal sexual conduct with a person under 13 years old. In Michigan, convicted felons may not possess any firearm.

Smith, who is one of 10 people in the Northville area who have been convicted of criminal sexual conduct, entered a plea of not guilty at 35th District Court in Plymouth and requested a court appointed attorney.

Judge Ron Lowe set the bond at \$2,000 or 10 percent at the request of Sumner with the conditions Smith not sell or possess narcotics and that he turn over all other firearms and ammunition to Northville Township police. Smith's preliminary hearing will be March 27.

Petrie dishes up culinary delights

Jason Petrie has a puff in his pastry, a spring in his soufflé and a diploma from the top culinary school in the country to his credit.

The 1993 Northville High School graduate recently completed a tour at the Culinary Institute of America in New York City. After an intense 18-month associates' program at the Institute, he will join some of the best chefs in the World in Germany this summer.

"I enjoy the creativity of it. I love going into a kitchen and being able to put different things together and make something out of it. But the best part is seeing people enjoy what I do. It just feels great," Petrie said.

Petrie describes his cooking as eclectic and without a specialty. However, he said he does like to cook up his own original creations. A few examples include his mouth-watering salmon encrusted in shoestring potatoes with a side of mescaline mixed greens, seared Ahi tuna topped with foiegras and smothered in pomegranate, blackberry, or raspberry sauce, and any number of different terrines.

He said he particularly liked doing terrine because they are so rarely done.

"They take an incredible amount of time to do and so a lot of chefs don't do them. They are kind of an old school traditional dish," Petrie said. "It is pure technique and

Board: more study needed on sex ed class

The sex education curriculum has broken a trust and shattered confidence, some local parents said at the instructional services subcommittee meeting March 21.

However, the Northville school board made an attempt to mend the rift with their decision to hold off a vote on the curriculum until everyone had a chance to be heard.

"We are referring this proposition back to the citizens' health advisory committee. We have no deadline, no decision that must be made tonight. We want to give everyone the opportunity to comment. There will be no decision made tonight," secretary Thomas Gudritz said.

The meeting originally was to cover the sex ed curriculum, as well as four proposed English curriculum revisions. But, Gudritz

said, because of the concern, the English revisions would be put off to a later date so suggestions for sex ed revisions could be recorded for the health advisory committee to review.

The health advisory committee is a 24 person voluntary panel composed of district teachers and administrators, local clergy, parents and health care workers. The committee originally voted on the curriculum March 6 and it passed 13-4 in favor of the curriculum. The four panel members in dissent were the four out of seven total committee parents present for the vote.

Gudritz summed up the parents concerns in a brief, itemized statement. The issues included: parents wanting the choice to opt their child out of the entire course rather than just the human sexuality module, not wanting a mixed

City cracks whip to recover tardy tax payments

City of Northville business owners who owe thousands in back property taxes have until March 31 to pay, city officials said.

According to a letter to Gary Word, Northville city manager, and the Northville City Council, from Nickle Bateson, finance director, the city began sending out past due notices March 17 to businesses who owe back property taxes — some as far back as 1994. Bateson said 436 letters were sent out with a total amount of \$33,439 owed. Of that amount, 77 percent is the principal amount of taxes owed, 18 percent is interest, 3 percent is administrative cost and 2 percent is penalties.

Unpaid personal property taxes only recently became a concern to city staff, Bateson said in the memo.

"To build on the current momentum of attentiveness to personal property taxes, however, I have spent over 50 hours within the past week ... to calculate penalties/inter-

est and generate letters to those who have not paid their personal property taxes," she said in the report. The Northville Record conducted an investigation that revealed several businesses owe thousands in unpaid taxes and that there may be a problem with the collection process the city had in place.

Personal property taxes are only paid by businesses on any property owned that is not affixed to the building. Computers and office equipment are examples. The city is responsible for collection of the taxes, which go into the general fund and support such services as police and fire.

Collecting the unpaid personal

Students learn NATO is neat-o

Colonel in Euro-army pays visit to Meads Mill Middle School

NATO forces invaded Meads Mill Middle School March 15, but did so peacefully.

Two North Atlantic Treaty Organization lieutenants visited the Meads compound to explain the purpose and importance of NATO to the pint-size patriots.

"It was interesting because I had never heard of NATO before," 12-year-old Lauren Schumann said. "I always like learning something new."

Lt. Col. Hendk Van Der Gaag of the Netherlands and Lt. Col. Hartmut Hager of Germany gave a multimedia presentation which included a brief history of the organization and showed students how NATO works in the world. They explained to students NATO is an alliance of 19 countries which are committed to each other's defense. However, they stressed they are not an aggressive alliance.

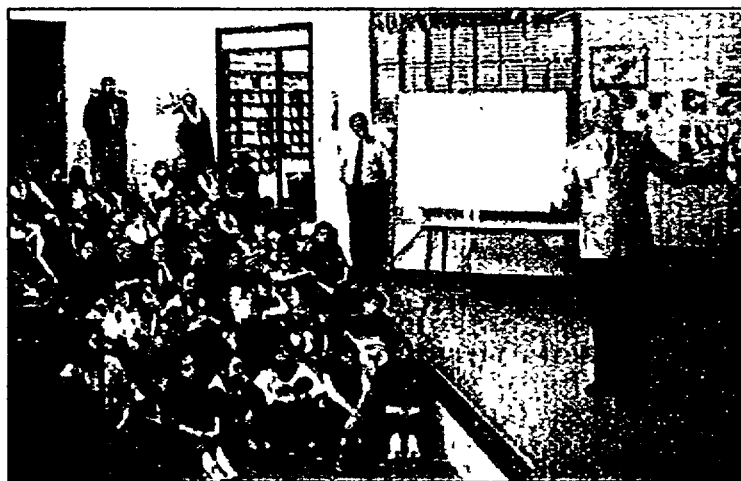

"NATO is a complicated system," Van Der Gaag said. "We are here for peacekeeping in a general sense and we work to promote freedom, stability and partnership for our allies."

They further explained to the students NATO is much different now than it was before the Cold War era and the reunification of Germany. Hager told them he had experienced Germany when it was "two countries" and though he lived in the West — which was free

— he understood the importance of maintaining that freedom and stability.

While Van Der Gaag attempted to break down the economic structure of NATO, he related NATO's budget to the allowances the students receive at home and talked of NATO's budget. He explained to students how larger and more populated countries contribute more money to balance out the smaller countries which are allowed to

Northville had hand in delay of special ed waiver, state reports

The Northville school district contributed to the four-month delay in the approval of the special education waiver, a State School official said.

Northville school district superintendent Leonard Rezmierski told the school board and parents in February the delay kept him in the dark regarding the delay in approval for the waiver. He said he had "absolutely no knowledge" of why there was such a delay.

However, state assistant superintendent and Northville resident Mike Williamson disagreed.

"That's false. It's wrong. It's pure unadulterated bull—, nothing could be further from the truth, but it is what I have come to expect from them," he said.

According to Williamson, not only did Rezmierski know why the waiver was delayed all along, but Williamson and state superintendent Arthur Ellis involved Rezmierski in the process.

The special ed waiver allows the

district to shorten the summer schedule for students with special needs. The waiver must be approved by the state for renewal.

Earlier this week, Rezmierski agreed with Williamson's assessment of the situation. The delay in the waiver, which was given to the State in November, kept the special education schedule for the regular school year as well as the summer program in limbo until February of this year. The delay was detrimental to students progress who needed to follow a strict routine as well as to parents who had to scramble to find qualified day care on short notice, parent Jay Julow said.

Williamson said there were a number of reasons for the delay. Including a parent complaint about the waiver made before the state school board. Parent Rick Zerod, whose son Andrew is severely impaired, opposed the waiver and has since 1998. Zerod said the extensive days off

Northville School Briefs

SCHOOL DISTRICT, TOWNSHIP LINK FOR POLICE GRANT

The Northville Township Police Department will be collaborating with the Northville School district in the possible implementation of a "Cops grant." The grant would allow the township to provide the district with a liaison officer.

So far the township has submitted a three-year grant proposal. The grant would pay 80 percent of the total cost of the police liaison officer.

At the end of three years, the funding for the program must be shared in some way between the school district and the township. Other LEAs including Walled Lake, Farmington, and Plymouth Canton, have a 50-50 or and 75-25 split in the cost.

The first year of the program which, if approved, would be 2000-2001, would be at no cost to the school district. The township has indicated it would pay the additional 20 percent for the first year.

The police liaison officer's duties would include the following:

- Help with the building safety plan;
- Work in curricular areas in classrooms dealing with issues of criminal behavior;
- Help counsel students and par-

ent:

- Be a liaison with the neighborhood surrounding the new high school and be a contact person for community policing issues; and;
- Be available to assist other buildings.

PHYSICS STUDENTS TO PARTICIPATE IN AMUSEMENT PARK FIELD STUDY

Northville High School Advanced Placement students are going to be participating in an educational romp through Cedar Point in Sandusky, Ohio May 25.

This is a park-designated day for students of physics. Students will study the rides at the park using a series of worksheets provided by Cedar Point. They will observe physics concepts as they solve problems related to the rides. Ideas of inertia, force, momentum, velocity, machines, work, and energy will be covered in their preparation for and experience of the day.

The sponsoring teacher is Sandra Vala and will include 44 of her students. They will depart Northville at 7 a.m. and will arrive home the same day at 10 p.m. The school will be chartering a bus from Wilmac Tours of Detroit. The total cost of the trip to students is

\$44 and they will be responsible for spending money for lunch and dinner.

TRIPS TO ITALY, GREECE PLANNED FOR 2001

While some NHS students are riding the loop de loop, others will be tripping the light fantastic European style the summer of 2001. As a supplement to the ancient and medieval history courses offered at the high school, students will be traveling to Greece and Italy.

The students' itinerary will include a walking tour of Italy, a guided excursion to Vatican City, sightseeing of Rome, an optional trip to Florence as well as some free time in Rome. Once in Greece, students will stay in Parras, do some sightseeing at Delphi, view the ruins of Athens as well as a sound and light show.

Students will leave June 20, 2001 and return July 2. They will be accompanied by chaperones NHS teachers Chris Ford and Monty Shambleau and 10 other adults. Twenty five students will attend with a cost of \$2,330 per student. This includes the basic program fee, registration fee, airline surcharge and an insurance fee.

MONETARY DONATIONS ROLL IN FOR DISTRICT

The Northville school district received several donations this month. Old Village School received a donation from the Otton family of \$681 to be used to improve their courtyard planting.

Last year, the school — with the assistance of the Northville Garden Club — began to work on the courtyard. The donation is will be used to purchase more plants for students to learn about and enjoy.

Additionally, Oak Pointe Church has donated \$5,000 to Hillside Middle School to be used to replace the light board in the auditorium. The donation will be added to the other funds to upgrade the lighting and sound system this summer

WAYNE SUPERINTENDENT ANNOUNCES RESA INITIATIVES

Wayne County Superintendent Mike Flanagan has announced several new initiatives targeted at dramatically improving student achievement in Wayne County. The initiatives are funded by Wayne County Regional Educational Service Agency's Operation Achievement program which has made \$2

million available to local school districts and RESA staff.

So far RESA, has received 78 applications totaling more than \$13.5 million.

These projects selected met stringent criteria, including demonstrated impact on student achievement, capacity building, links to the curriculum framework, and maximizing use of technology.

RESA selects and gives preference to those proposals that have the capacity to reach the largest potential audience, for example, providing professional development to all middle school science teachers in Wayne County via teleconferencing.

Several projects are already slated to be funded by Operation Achievement and are as follows:

EARLY LITERACY RESOURCES AND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT: This program will focus on increased literacy achievement in grades K-3. Building on initiatives already underway in Wayne County, K-3, special education, and preschool teachers will participate in a series of teleconferenced professional development activities targeting early literacy. In addition, a database of appropriate reading materials will be created.

HOW TO DEVELOP ON-LINE COURSES: This is a RESA initiative that will train high school teachers in the development of unique academic courses for high school students and RESA consultants in the development of online professional learning courses for teachers.

The training will teach local district and RESA staff the best practice for online learning and will create the technological infrastructure needed to manage and maintain on-line courses.

MANAGING MATH AND SCIENCE: This program will focus on improved achievement for elementary grade students in math and science.

Through a series of teleconferences/video rebroadcasts videotaped lessons and coordinated lesson plans demonstrating best practices in the use of manipulative with students, non-tenured teachers in grades 2 through 5 will be trained in effectively using and managing hands-on tools in the classroom.

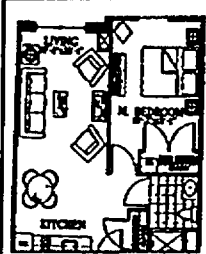

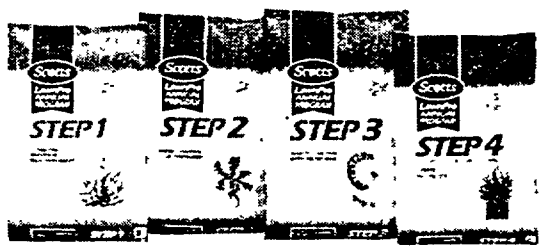

Warmer weather paves way for start of construction season

As the snow season winds down, Michigan residents should prepare for the state's other season: construction.

And while last year may have been the mother of all construction seasons, 2000 promises to have its fair share.

From sidewalk replacements to more paving of Six Mile Road, city and township planners have plenty of construction in mind.

"The reconstruction of Center Street last year may have been the biggest single project this city will see for a long time in terms of the amount of people affected," said Jim Gallogly, city of Northville director of public works. "Our projects this year aren't as big so they won't affect as many people."

For instance, one of the first projects will be the repair of bad sidewalks in the city starting with the Cabbage Town area this year in May or June.

Some of the bigger projects scheduled include the reconstruction of East Cady Street between South Main Street and Center Street for about \$200,000 and the replacement of the 12-inch diameter water main between Center Street and Old Novi Road along Base Line Road for about \$700,000.

The new water main will better supply the northeast section of the city and provide the needed fire protection for the condominium development planned for the intersection of Old Novi Road and Base Line Road. Phoenix Land Development, the developer of the site, will share the cost.

The water main project will begin in the late summer and the Cady Street project will begin in late fall, Gallogly said.

The reconstruction of East Cady Street is a necessity, he said, because of the poor condition of the road, especially east of Griswold.

"And it just so happens interest in the area is growing," Gallogly said. Several developers have drawn up plans or made proposals for the area.

Construction is following development in Northville Township as well.

Don Weaver, director of public services in Northville Township, said the township has "a lot going on" as far as construction goes. One of the biggest projects will be the continued paving of Six Mile Road

"The developer has agreed to fund a portion of the repaving of Six Mile Road between Ridge and Beck," Weaver said. "I anticipate the project will take place this summer."

Weaver said the cost of the project is unknown, but said the paving of Six Mile Road between Sheldon and Beck last year was about \$1 million. The developer of Stonewater must pay 20 percent of the cost, Weaver said.

The paving of Six Mile Road won't be the only project along the thoroughfare this year.

Weaver said a bike path between Haggerty Road and Northville Road on Six Mile is planned. The path eventually will be part of a large loop.

"The overall plan for the township is to have a trail system," Weaver said.

Construction is expected to begin in June for the bike trail, he said.

School district outlines goals for remainder of year

Though a little late for New Year's the Northville Public School district recently released its list of goals for the year.

In addition to their standard long term goals the district has also developed a number of goals for the year. These include plans for evaluating the high School Seminar scheduling plan, the move to the new high school, middle school attendance and reviewing the Future Facilities Committee report recommendations.

The goals are annually recommended by the school improvement committees and are broad recommendations. They are then reviewed by the building administrators and passed along to central office administration where further recommendations are made. They are then given to the school board for final review and approval.

"This is a very good process for our district to go through," superintendent Leonard Rezmierski said.

There are several long-term goals that the district maintains and continues to improve on each

year, according to Rezmierski.

They include providing an environment of encouragement, support and understanding. That involves incorporating the graduate profile as well as collecting students and graduate data which administrators use to guide curriculum.

Further, Rezmierski said though he believed the district as a whole was doing well they, it would not rest on its laurels. That sentiment was reflected in the goal which states the district would "implement and evaluate the district planning process emphasizing the importance of continuous school improvement."

Additionally, the third of the district goals addresses some of the concerns of parents in the district.

With that goal, the district will continue to analyze the recommendations of the Elementary school day committee report which dealt with class size, use of teacher assistants, time/schedules, and curriculum mapping/integration.

"Curriculum alone is a massive undertaking," Rezmierski said. "We have taken an aggressive

approach in matching the state benchmarks in our curriculum. Further, with mapping we can sit down with the parent of a kindergarten and show them what Susie or Johnny will be learning all the way through grade 12."

As for annual goals, the district plans to review the data gathered in the recent high school seminar scheduling plan survey.

The school improvement com-

mittees will be making their recommendations to the board at the end of the school year. However, things look promising for the scheduling plan which received high marks among parents, staff, students and graduates of the high school.

Also, the district is constantly making plans for the big move coming this summer, Rezmierski said. Groups of volunteers are

already helping Cooke and NHS organize and pack while professional movers will be taking the lead July 17. The transition, of course being the multiple moves of Cooke Middle School to Hillside Middle School, the Bryant Center program to Cooke Middle School and the opening of the new High School.

"We are looking forward to the grand opening of the high school and the open house at Hillside," Rezmierski said. "We are all very proud."

The district also plans on reviewing and implementing the future facilities report recommendations as appropriate. Assistant superintendent Dave Bolitho said the central office administration,

as well as elementary building administrators, are in the process of evaluating their options to relieve the overcrowding those schools will face next year. Bolitho said the district was looking into putting teachers of courses such as music, art, and foreign language on carts as well as adding some portable classrooms.

Additionally, the district has already begun steps to accomplish one of their goals. They have evaluated and changed the districts middle school boundaries which will be effective in the autumn.

Northville Area Briefs

CENSUS PARTICIPATION URGED BY TOWNSHIP BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The Northville Township board of trustees has approved a resolution declaring Census 2000 as a top priority in the township.

In its resolution the board said "the Charter Township of Northville Board of Trustees do hereby declare Census 2000 as a top priority for stakeholders and leaders within our community and encourage participation by members of our staff in matters related to technical preparation for census 2000 including the annual boundary and annexation survey and the local update of census addresses."

The resolution was passed at the regular meeting March 16.

TOWNSHIP BOARD APPROVES PURCHASE OF EQUIPMENT

The Northville Township board of trustees has approved the purchase of several pieces of equipment for the public safety department.

The equipment includes: a Maratrac VHF mobile radio for \$2,040; 24 Motorola HT-1000 VHF portation radios and four HT-1000 VHF chargers for \$18,200; a DV camcorder and digital camera for \$2,197.

The items have all fall within the budget of the public safety department.

BLOCK PARTY RESOLUTION PASSED BY BOARD FOR TOWNSHIP

The Northville Township board of trustees passed a resolution requiring residents to obtain a permit before closing a road for a block party.

The resolution requires the township to "indemnify, save harmless, and defend Wayne County, the Wayne County Department of Public Services, its officials, agents and employees against any and all claims, suits and judgments of every name and description arising out of the temporary road closure authorized."

The resolution authorizes the

township clerk to sign the necessary paper work for any persons wishing to have a block party.

APPROVES TWO STANDARD BILLS OF SALE

The Northville Township board of trustees has approved several standard bills of sale.

The bills approved include: the bills of sale for the public watermain and sanitary sewer and the sanitary sewer and watermain easements for the Woodlands North No. 1 subdivision in the amount of \$1 each; the bills of sale for the public watermain and sanitary sewer for Brookstone subdivision No. 2 in the amount of \$1 each.

MAINTENANCE AGREEMENTS SIGNED FOR TWO SUBDIVISIONS

The Northville Township board of trustees approved two maintenance

agreements for the Woodlands North subdivision.

The first transfers the township obligation to landscape the subdivision to the homeowner's association. Wayne County obligates the township to maintain certain landscape and bike path facilities.

The second agreement transfers the township obligation to maintain storm drainage facilities in the subdivision to the homeowner's association.

FINAL PLATS APPROVED FOR TWO SUBDIVISIONS IN NORTHVILLE

The Northville Township board of trustees approved two plats at its most recent meeting.

The first plat was an extension of a preliminary plat approval for the Falls of Northville. A representative for Hamilton Land Development Inc., the developer of the land, said "unexpected and unforeseen obstacles" have hindered the development process.

The preliminary plat was approved until April 23, 2001.

The second plat was for final approval of the Brookstone No. 2 subdivision.

Plats identify road and lot arrangement of any given piece of property.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS TO HOLD TOOTSIE ROLL DRIVE

The Northville Township board of trustees has given the Knights of Columbus Council No. 3959 permission to conduct its annual Tootsie Roll Fund drive.

The event will be April 14-16. The request gives Knights of Columbus members permission to solicit on the corners of the township.

Additionally, the board of trustees has declared those dates as Knights of Columbus Help Mentally Handicapped days in Northville Township.

TEN-YEAR AGREEMENT SIGNED FOR MAINTENANCE OF LIGHTS

The Northville Township board of trustees approved a 10-year agreement with MUSCO for a 10-year service agreement of lighting at Northville Community Park.

The program would include: regular monitoring of equipment; preventative maintenance including parts and labor; complete relamping in 2010. The cost of the contract is \$26,638.

FIRST PAYMENT FOR LIGHTING AT NORTHVILLE PARK APPROVED

The Northville Township board of trustees has approved the first payment for lighting at the Northville Community Park Athletic Field.

The payment is for the amount of \$22,500 and will be paid to G&B Electric.

The total cost of the contract awarded to G&B Dec. 7, 1999 was \$374,500.

Board hires Lansing firm to seek out superintendent

The Northville Township board of trustees has managed to take a major step in finding a township superintendent.

The board has voted to hire a search firm to find the perfect candidate to be the next manager of the township. Lansing-based Mercer Group was selected as the firm to lead the search.

"Their plan is to have a lot of input from the board and take a real look at the culture of the (township) organization," Mark Abbo, board treasurer, said. "I think that was something the board really liked."

The township board voted last December to appoint a township superintendent to oversee the day-to-day operations of township departments. The decision came two years after the board of trustees commissioned a study to be done by the Northville Township Management Study Committee to determine why the township was having problems keeping a manager in place.

The contract for the search firm is not to exceed \$16,500 and does not include traveling expenses

for the candidates. The costs will be funded through the use of the portion of the 2000 township manager budget and the remainder from the township consultant services allocation.

The firm was recommended by several other government bodies to Bill Pomeroy, township trustee.

In a report to the board, Pomeroy said Mercer was "very highly recommended by Steve Brock, Farmington Hills city manager, Larry Doyle, Royal Oak city manager, Bill Costick, city manager of Farmington Hills for 20 years and Jerry Richards, Meridian Township manager."

Several board members expressed interest in getting the new superintendent in place before the board of trustees elec-

tion in November.

"I don't want to rush it," said Sue Hillebrand, township trustee and clerk. "But I most definitely think we should make a decision before November."

While the search firm works with township officials and staff, Hillebrand said, work will continue on putting an ordinance in place that will give the superintendent the authority to carry out his or her powers. The lack of an ordinance was identified by the management study committee as a major reason previous managers had problems.

"We should have a first reading of the ordinance next month," Hillebrand said.

Russ Fogg, township trustee, said he's not in a hurry to get someone appointed to the position.

"We have great department heads who are on the caliber of the kind of manager we want anyway," Fogg said. "I'm not in any hurry just for the sake of having somebody in place."

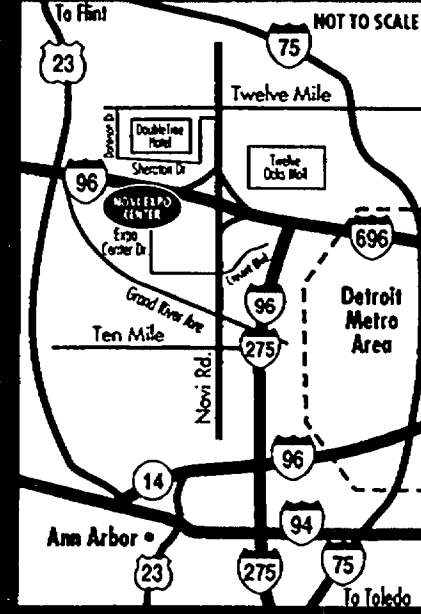

Metro Detroit wins big in state's five-year road funding

Southeast Michigan will get a lion's share of the state's road work over the next four years, according to the "5 Year Road and Bridge Program" unveiled Tuesday, Jan. 25, by the Michigan Department of Transportation.

Of the \$6.4 billion the state plans to spend on road repairs and upgrades through the end of the year 2004, 35 percent will be pumped into the metropolitan Detroit region, including Wayne, Oakland, Macomb and St. Clair counties.

Metro Detroit has the oldest freeways and bridges in the state, while the region contains the state's largest concentration of population. Metro area freeways carry almost half — 43 percent — of all the state's traffic.

"All transportation improvements included in this plan are prioritized based on need, and we are continuing to fix the worst roads and

bridges first," said James DeSana, Director of MDOT.

What the MDOT refers to as the "Priority" region of the state — areas surrounding Lansing and Ann Arbor, including Ingham, Livingston, Shiawassee, Clinton, Eaton and Jackson counties — will get another 12 percent of the state funding.

Using increased funding from the federal government, through the Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century (TEA-21), and Build Michigan II, the state will put an average of \$1.3 billion dollars into repairing and rebuilding 1,400 miles of roads and 280 bridges each year through 2004, according to the document.

The goal is to have 80 percent of the state's roads in "good condition," as opposed to poor condition, by the end 2004. The plan is to continue through the year 2007, when 90 percent will be in the "good" category.

Although the state is using a mix of short-term and long-term solu-

tions to Michigan's road troubles, the 5 Year plan says the proportion of "20-plus year fixes" is increasing. Thirty three percent of the money will be spent on long term repairs, according to the plan. In the early 1990s, only 10 percent of state road funding was spent on long term repair.

The program also puts the priority on repaving existing roads. Only 10 percent of the total will be spent on new roads.

One of the new roads to be built will be in southeast Michigan — the state will complete the M-5 Haggerty Connector from Fourteen Mile Road to Pontiac Trail, but its completion date has been pushed back to 2002.

In the metro area, MDOT will concentrate on modernizing the freeways, improving border crossings, supporting economic development and eliminating choke points, the plan states.

Also on the list of projects are:

IN OAKLAND COUNTY
• Addition of a northbound lane on I-75 from Square Lake Road to M-59. Construction is scheduled for 2001.

• Reconstruction of interchanges on I-96 at Beck and Wixom roads. Design work begins this year. Construction is set for 2002 and 2003.

• Construction of a new interchange on M-59 at Squirrel Road. Work will be completed this sum-

mer.
• Improvement of the interchange on M-59 at Crooks Roads, in conjunction with the widening of Crooks.

• Studying widening to five lanes M-15 from I-75 in Oakland County to I-69 in Genesee.

• Researching relocation of the interchange on M-59 at Adams Road.

• Studying reconstruction of the interchange on I-75 at Crooks. Preliminary engineering will be initiated this year.

• Completion of an I-75 Corridor Study of the 46 miles of freeways in Oakland, its interchanges and supporting roadways.

• Study of alternative improvements to the Northwestern Connector, evaluating upgrades to Orchard Lake, Fourteen Mile and Maple. Research will be completed in April 2001.

• I-75 from M-15 to the county line will get a "major rehabilitation" in 2003 and 2004.

• I-75 will get multiple bridge

deck replacements in 2000 and 2001.

• Woodward will be resurfaced from the north Ferndale city limits to M-102 in 2003.

IN WAYNE COUNTY

• I-96 from US-24 to west of M-39 will be reconstructed in the year 2004.

• The bridge on I-96 at Merriman will get deck replacement in 2001.

• Six bridges on I-96 will get approach work in 2001.

• Ford Road, from Wayne Road east to Venoy, will be resurfaced this year.

• Ford Road, from Mercury to US-12, will be reconstructed in 2004. Bridges will get deck replacements and deck patch along with it.

• The Southfield, M-39, will see reconstruction and bridge rehabilitation in 2001.

• Ann Arbor Road, Old M-14, will get reconstruction from Canton Center to Newburgh Road this year and next.



Lawmakers grapple with library Internet legislation

There are dangerous places in the world where parents should not let their children venture alone. Should the public library be one of them?

Howell resident Stephanie Williams says it has gone that far because of the unfiltered, unmonitored Internet terminals available for use in some libraries.

"The (American Civil Liberties Union) says it is up to parents to monitor their children," she said. "But if your child wants to go to the library to research a high school term paper, should you have to sit right there to watch the entire time?"

Williams testified before the

Michigan Senate Judiciary Committee in support of Senate Bill 936, which would mandate that libraries adopt policies aimed at keeping under age patrons from viewing "obscene or sexually explicit matter that is harmful to minors."

She pointed out to committee members that the bill addresses materials which, if supplied directly to minors by a private company like a convenience store or video rental shop, would leave that firm subject to prosecution.

The verbiage "harmful to minors" is a key to the legislation, according to Sylvia Warner, aide to Sen. Mike Rogers, R-Howell, the sponsor of the legislation.

Material considered "harmful to minors" is material that is already

illegal to possess, such as child pornography, Warner said.

Although Rogers' bill has not received a vote yet in committee, Warner said he hoped to get the bill to the Senate floor in the near future.

The state Legislature addressed the issue of Internet access at libraries last year, giving approval to a plan by Rep. Nancy Cassis, R-Nowi, allowing libraries to segregate Internet terminals for adults from those intended for use by youngsters, and allowing the terminals used by minors to be filtered to prevent access to pornography sites.

That bill was intended to answer First Amendment concerns about filtering which have turned into lawsuits for some libraries. Cassis

believed constitutional concerns would be avoided if some terminals would be filtered while others were left open for full Internet access by adults.

Rogers' bill takes the issue a step further, essentially mandating it. His bill would require the libraries:

- Provide access in a way as to prevent a minor from viewing obscene materials.
- Require an adult library employee to monitor the terminals being used by minors.
- Arranging the terminals in a configuration that allows a library staff employee to view the terminals

used by minors at all times.

The bill would also relieve the library of liability if it took reasonable steps to prevent youngsters from viewing pornography.

Warner said the problem of pornography on the Internet is extensive. Estimates place the number of sexually explicit sites on the World Wide Web at 900,000, she said. It has been brought to the senator's attention that youngsters in his district were trading computer diskettes of porn sites they had downloaded at the library, she said.

And Warner said her office has heard from the parents of children

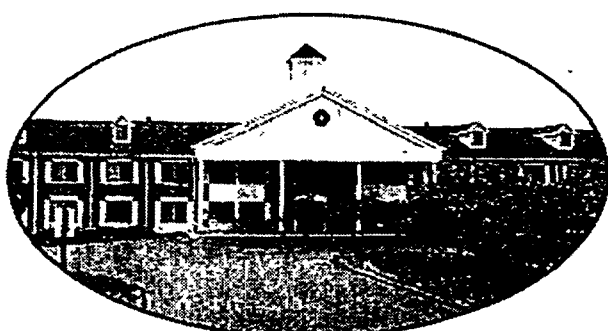
who do not want to return to the library because of obscene pictures they've seen over the shoulder of another library patron.

The Michigan chapter of the ACLU is indeed opposing the legislation, arguing that filtering software is not effective. Such filtering programs often operate based on keywords, blocking access when the software detects obscene language. That means some pornography gets through anyway, while the program blocks access to some legitimate sites users may have good reason to view.

Modern Navy experience, as told by Northville native

A sailor's work is never done, as Petty Officer Shawn Felix shares with Northville this week. Many of us never know what it is like to be sequestered on a city-sized boat. We fill our days with familiar sights and sounds and though it's a rat race, many of us come home to friends and family.

However, Shawn helps us to realize the differences between day to day land life and life afloat. He further shows not everything is how it should seem when at sea. In the following article, Shawn explains his daily grind.

Drinking, womanizing and bar fights are images of the Navy through the eyes of Hollywood. Fortunately or unfortunately, it is not like that, on a regular basis anyway. The brief three to five day in port periods that happen every two to four weeks is the portion Hollywood chooses to show. The 12 to 20 hour workday is conveniently left out, as no one would really be interested in the long

hours of work that are done. Hollywood's distorted image reflects only the smallest portion of Navy life.

Workdays consisting of 12-20 hours a day are so easily dismissed in people's minds and days off are non-existent when at sea. Days are easily forgotten in the never-ending monotony of work. Time is judged by whether you are working or not, and it is relative.

The amount of time depends solely on the individual job. Blue moons are more likely than days off when at sea.

My typical day starts waking up at 6:30 a.m., beginning it all with a wake-up shower to get ready to go at 7:00 a.m. The day starts a little later for me than most because I am not a breakfast eater. Shipboard food is less than agreeable with my stomach first thing in the morning. Once 7:00 a.m. rolls around, it's almost comparable to taking attendance in school but is referred to as quarters in Navy. It is a little bit of a routine rendezvous for you and all your co-workers. Quarters consist also of a briefing on everything that will happen throughout the day and in the near future.

Shortly after quarters is completed, an hour-long cleaning session is held throughout the whole ship. Yes, that is right, all work stopped for an hour a day to make sure everyone cleans. Everyone is responsible for a place assigned to clean. Exceptions are those of a higher rank. After spending a gen-

erous chunk of life in this Navy, you earn the privilege of not having to clean up after yourself. Following the first of the janitorial sessions for the day, it's back to the job.

Once the cleaning time is complete, it is back to the office where I handle the never-ending process of checking people on the ship.

Usually a few times a week people are flown out to the ship to check on; in the same respect, people are flown off.

Jobs vary greatly from working in an office to directing jets on the flight deck to observing for 5,000 people on the ship. Obvious things change with the job you do, which varies the hours worked greatly. Days on the flight deck can be long when launching jets, which is almost every day for different amounts of time.

When not launching jets, regular maintenance on jets, as well as the launching and landing equipment is done.

A cook's schedule is set in two shifts, since meals are on a regular schedule. Office jobs are much the same as only certain hours are necessary for someone to work.

The rowdy image of the Navy is more illusion than reality. The truth of hard-worked hours is not often recognized or remembered.

Historical Tidbits

On April 12, 1827, the board of supervisors laid out boundaries for the following townships: Detroit, Springwells, Hamtramck, Monguagon, Brownstown, Plymouth, Ecorse, Huron and Bucklin. The latter township went out of existence with the establishment of Nankin and Pekin in 1829. Pekin was later changed to Redford and Dearborn was created out of part of Pekin.

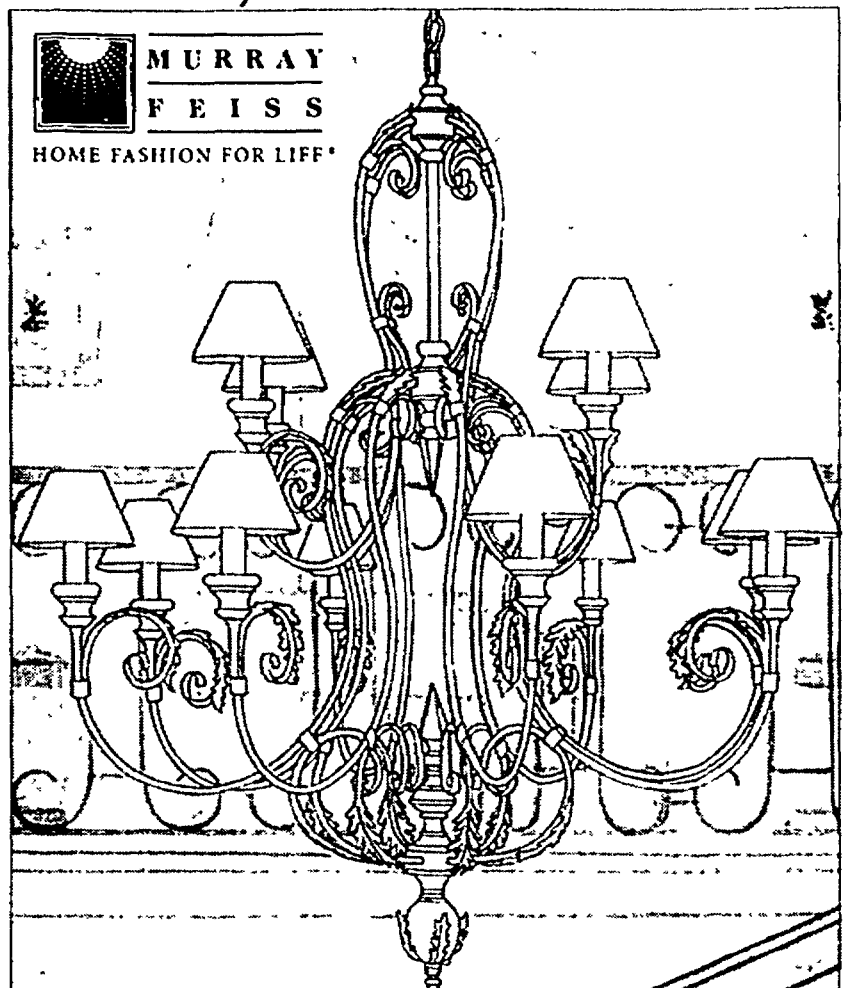
Soon these townships were added: Greenfield, Canton, Livonia, Romulus, Van Buren,

Sumpter, and Taylor. Romulus was later renamed Wayne.

Plymouth Township, named in honor of the first American settlement at Plymouth Rock, was created in 1827. It included all of what is now called Northville, Canton and Plymouth townships. On the northern half of the township of Plymouth, in the hilly region at the northwest corner of the county, a tiny village developed. It was called Northville. (From "Northville, The First Hundred Years" by Jack Hoffman.)

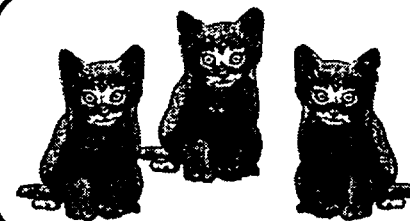
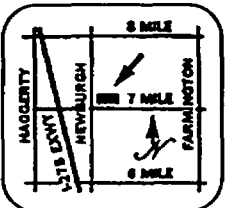

Northville doctor remembered as friend, mentor

In a span of a matter of seconds, Dr. William Conley could go from scaring the staff at the Northville health clinic he worked to consoling a seriously ill person.

It was part of his complex personality, which lit up the faces of those who knew him.

Atchinson died in his sleep Monday at his home. He was 67.

Dr. Russell Atchinson, a fellow physician who knew Conley through the years, remembered Conley as a man who went out of his way to help people.

"He was a very kind physician," Atchinson said. "He had a very good reputation among his patients and fellow doctors."

When he wasn't working in his family practice, Conley spent a large amount of time working at Angela Hospice in Livonia. Doris Bevington, a registered nurse at Angela Hospice, described Conley as a friend and a mentor.

"He had a wealth of knowledge that he wanted to impart to us, and sometimes got rather frustrated with us if we didn't follow his instructions as directed," she said. "When a few of us were sent to a hospice conference in England, he was our protector and looked out for us in whatever place we were. He was a wonderful person and my life and professional growth has been enriched by the privilege of knowing him."

Another person who spoke highly of Conley was Domino's Pizza owner Tom Monaghan, who shared in Conley's faith as a parishoner at Old St. Patrick's Roman Catholic Church in Ann Arbor.

"Dr. Conley was a friend of mine for many years," Monaghan said. "He was a devout Catholic and a positive example for everyone in the local community of a man who lived his faith. He will be missed."

Monaghan spoke of the free medical care Conley provided to residents at Dawn Farms and of the visits he made to inmates at state correctional facilities in Milan.

Funeral arrangements for Dr. Conley were not known at press time.

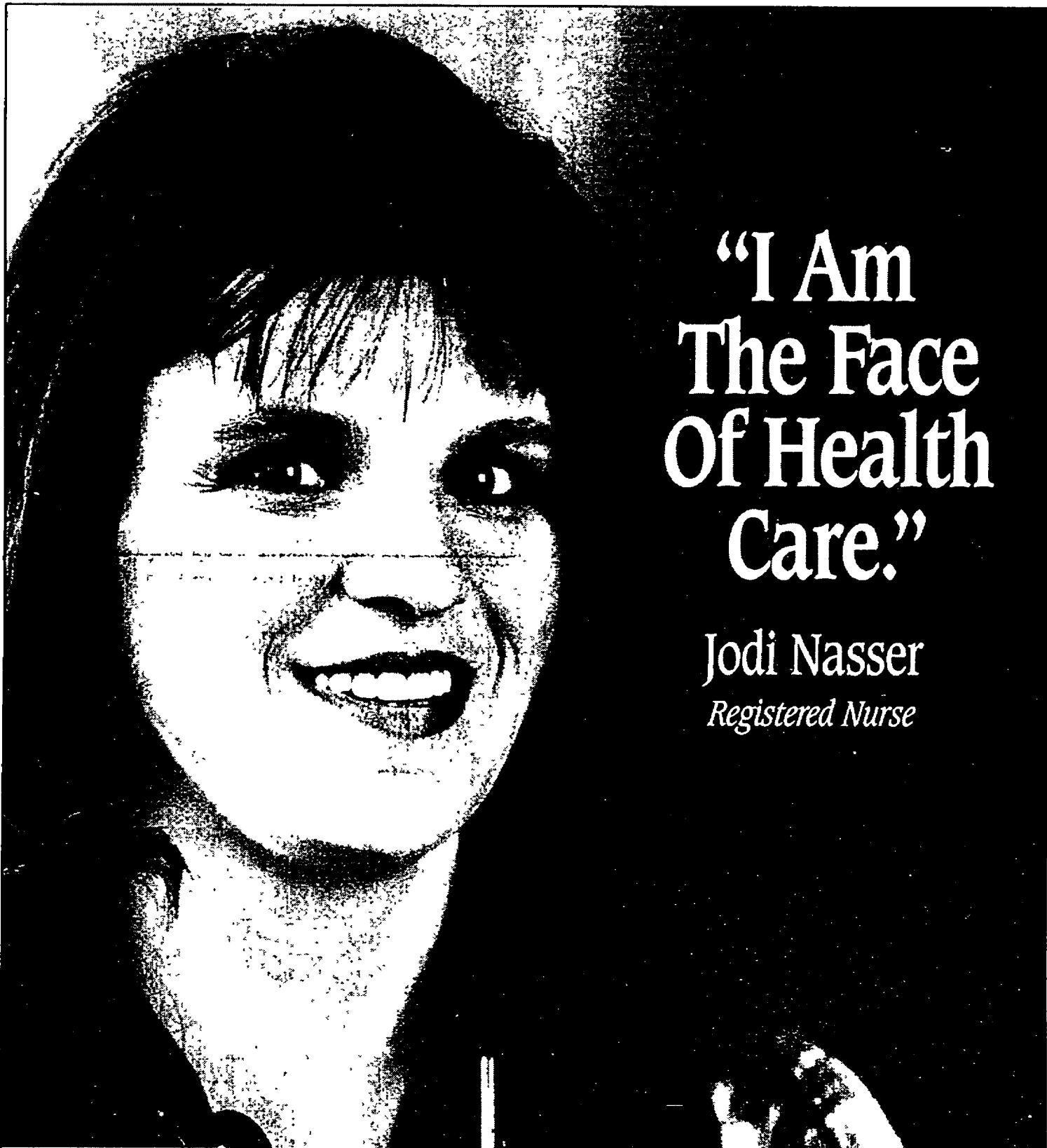

caused severe regressions in Andrew's and other students' progress. He presented that information and medical information to the state school board in December. His presentation came shortly before the board reviewing the waiver was to convene.

Williamson said, "I have come to expect from (the school district.)"

needed to properly process or evaluate the waiver," he said.

To renew the waiver, the district must provide parent and staff survey data as well as a formal application for the renewal, Williamson said. Though the district had the information, they did not provide it to the state until it was requested, he said.

"We called them and requested this information, which they sent," Williamson said.

However, this did add to the delay he said.

Rezmierski agreed the district did have to send additional information.

Ultimately, Williamson said Ellis did approve the waiver with some modifications. Williamson said the state required assurances from the district that the waiver would reflect 215 days — the minimum required by law — as opposed to the 213 asked for but the waiver. Additionally, the district had to promise the students would be out of school for no longer than two weeks at a time.

Even that took an additional month, Williamson said, but the district complied.

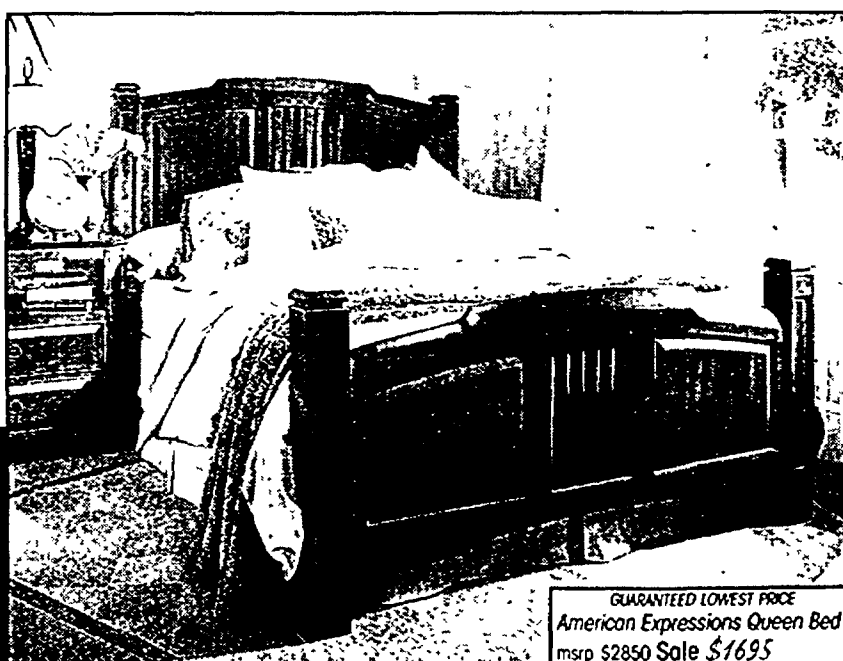

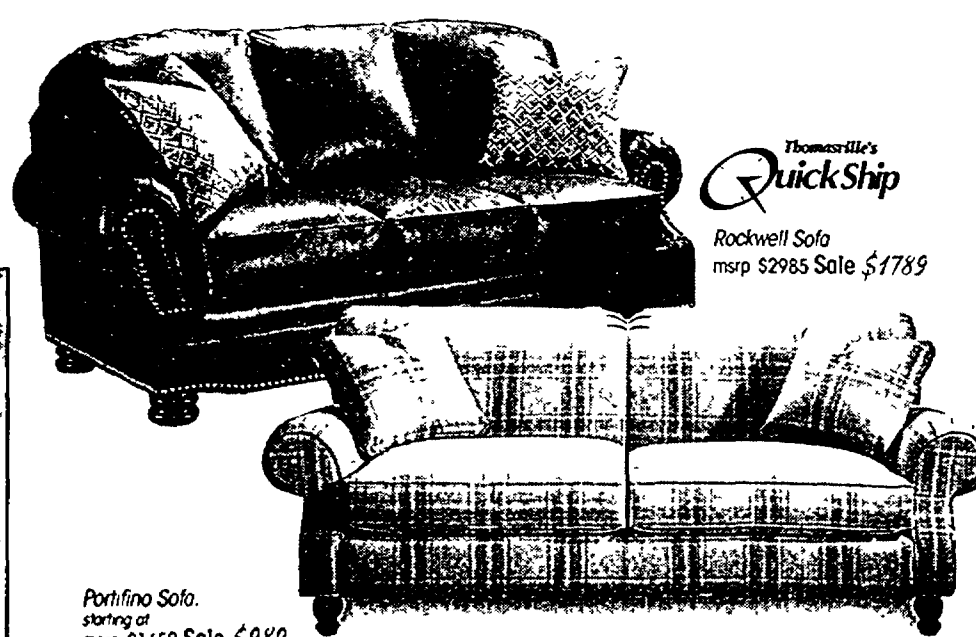

Filino adds name to race for 20th State House seat

A Northville area volunteer and businesswoman wants to take her community commitment to the next level, she said.

Teresa Filino announced March 20 that she plans to run for state representative for the 20th District and fill the open seat to be vacated by State Rep. Gerald Law, R-Plymouth. Her professional experience includes work as a senior representative at State Farm since 1982.

Folino said she believes her profes-

She opposes the current voucher proposal and supports tax credits for parents of children in private schools, lifting the cap on charters, two-third supermajority tax proposal, tax relief, elimination of the small business tax and increasing penalties for violent repeat offenders.

Folino already has picked up a number of endorsements including: Candice Miller, secretary of state; Lyn Banks, Wayne County commission; Chris Johnson, Northville mayor; Kevin Hartshorne, Northville City Council; Mark Abbo, Northville Township treasurer; Russ Fogg, Northville Township trustee; and other officials from Livonia and Plymouth.

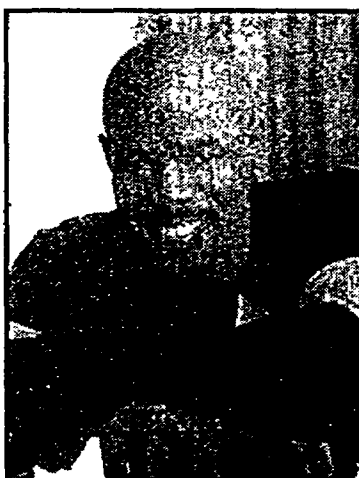

gender/ age class, and having a preference for an abstinence-centered course, not abstinence-based.

The difference between the two is minor but crucial, some parents said. In an abstinence-based course, students are taught that abstinence is the best way to stay safe if they engage in sex. An abstinence-centered curriculum maintains abstinence is the only option for safety.

Before the parents spoke, many of the school board members raised some of their own concerns as parents and offered some suggestions with some disclaimer.

"These are strictly my own opinions and not that of the board, and I reserve the right to change my mind," trustee Jerry Rupley said. "It is important that someone take responsibility in guiding these children. Each child should receive in the same manner and from the same source information. However, we should consider alternatives and have a curriculum that allows for some flexibility."

His suggestions included creating an at-home option where parents could teach their children the required material in their own way.

He said there would have to be a way of testing the students, but that would afford parents the option of imparting the values they wanted their children to have. He also suggested offering two versions of the course: one abstinence centered and the other comprehensive.

Further, treasurer Joan Wadsworth said she would like to see a curriculum that had more of an emphasis on the emotional

impact of sex

"I think we are missing some focus on the emotional aspects of this behavior and I think we should look for some ways in which we can introduce that," she said. "But we all have a responsibility to provide information that gives kids the greatest likelihood of avoiding risk behaviors."

For vice president Martha Nield, she had more questions than answers. She said she wanted to know the qualifications for educators who would teach the course, as well as what would happen in the event a substitute needed to be brought in.

She also offered some suggestions of ways to get parents directly involved in the curriculum.

"I think once we've hammered some things out I would like to see a syllabus great in detail. The kind of detail that is like follow the bouncing ball at the dinner table," she said.

Nield also said she would like to see assignments going home which required parental input in order to be complete.

In addition to the board's suggestions, parents had several of their own. Abe Laabs said he believed the class should remain a

requirement. However, he did not feel his daughter could ask all of her questions in a co-ed class. While he said he saw the value in her learning to discuss some of these topics with males, he said there may be some things she would be too embarrassed to talk about.

"I would like to see some class time set aside each day where the students are separated so they do have an opportunity to ask those types of questions. Otherwise I'm afraid they might never get asked," Laabs said.

Parent Barb Bennet said she wanted to see the class as an elective and was collecting signatures to make it so. Taxpayer Karen Mizorin said she did not understand why a new health curriculum was necessary given the two classes already in existence.

"It's seems simple to me. You have a parenting decisions class and a healthy living class. Both are optional and available for students. Why do you need a third that is mandatory?" she said.

But the students who spoke at the meeting suggested there was a need for the class to be mandatory. Class president Heather Gillespie said if the class was optional, many students who needed the information the most might not take it. Another student, Dan Ferrara, said he agreed, and suggested that students should be allowed to decide what is best for them.

"We are the ones who have to deal with these choices and issues everyday," he said. "I think we know best what we want to learn."

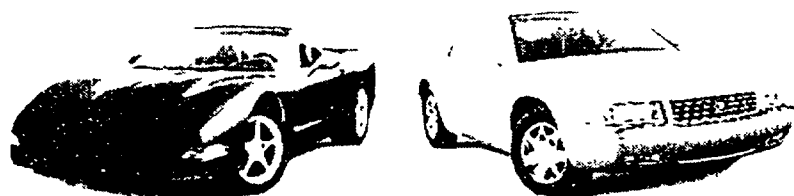

property taxes has been low priority for a number of reasons, Bateson said, including the dollar amount, the inability to upgrade the computer system to include a delinquent tax module and a struggle to hire staff for the tax department.

"Due to the relatively low dollar value of uncollected property taxes, in addition to tax department staff shortages over the past three years, the project has been a low priority," Bateson said.

The amount owed, according to a city audit from June 30, 1999, was \$30,221. And though officials stress the "relatively low dollar value of uncollected property taxes" the \$30,221 would cover the cost of the \$9,500 upgrade computer system and contribute to the salary of tax personnel.

The problem with the computer system, Bateson said, is that it's DOS-based. Upgrades to Windows-based systems are not available unless the entire system is replaced, she said.

Bateson said businesses who

continue not to pay their delinquent tax bills will receive a monthly letter indicating interest charges increases that will be effective every month.

"They will be sent a letter saying that to avoid additional interest charges they have until the end of the month," she said.

The interest charges generally will go up about 1 percent a month. For instance, businesses that owe for summer 1994 taxes will be charged an interest rate of 63.5

percent if they pay their bills before April 1. After April 1, the charge increases to 64.5 percent.

Word said it is important to note the city is addressing the problem.

"We know we need to have a better record on these things and we know we have a problem," he said. "That's why we have initiated these solutions."

that's what I like about them."

When asked to describe a terrine for the culinary-challenged, he said one would "have to see one to understand it."

Petrie said he thinks dishes like the ones he makes have lost their popularity because so many people want to get in and get out of restaurants and don't have the time to wait for the more complicated dishes. Petrie said he hopes to see a resurgence of them someday.

But his tempting terrines came after years of study and training on some of the best grounds in the world. His craving for cooking began when he interned at the Iroquois Hotel on Mackinac Island. He said he was struck by how much the chefs loved their work.

"They weren't there for the money," Petrie said. "They just enjoyed their work and did it for the love of food and their work."

From there he went on to study with chefs at the Four Seasons in Chicago, Troutbeck and Restaurant Danielle, both in New York.

Petrie said his inspiration was Chef Boulard out of New York City, but it was not the chef's food that impressed Petrie. Rather, it was his work ethic.

"He is a working chef. He's in his kitchen 12 hours a day, making sure everything is perfect and everyone is doing what they are supposed to," he said.

His admiration for the way the man works might be an indication of how Petrie will run his own restaurant which he hopes to open

in the next five or 10 years.

"I don't know what kind of food I want to serve but it will definitely be fine dining. White table cloths and silver and food that takes time to prepare and is more creative. I don't want it to be a place where we shovel out crap. There's just no joy in that for me," he said.

In the meantime, Petrie will begin at the World's Feast in Germany in May as a sous chef. He said his biggest worry at the moment is brushing up on his German.

"I don't know any German at all so I really have to start studying," he said.

Our Hometown Heroes deserve a pat on the back

The above verse led off an Eccentric editorial last July in praise of volunteers and volunteerism. Wouldn't it be wonderful, we asked, if our collective communities could somehow deliver a more hearty thank you to those who volunteer?

Well, thanks to Lighthouse CEO K. Noreen Keating and a lot of others, there's now something called the HomeTown Heroes Awards. The inaugural awards luncheon for volunteers will take place at noon next Wednesday, March 29, at Birmingham's Townsend Hotel.

Sponsored jointly by Lighthouse, a Pontiac-based women's shelter; The Eccentric Newspapers; HomeTown Newspapers; Mirror Newspapers and Crain's Detroit Business, the program will honor volunteers in six categories: senior, youth, boards and commissions, direct service, faith-based and business.

reward. They'll tell you that they get as much as they give through volunteerism, and that service to others helps them feel closer to their communities.

At local honors programs, we've heard comments like, "they come in quietly, quickly they do their jobs and then they disappear, and 'these people grease the wheels and make things run right.'"

Let the students speak — without interruption, please

We're all for open dialogue on a topic — and doubly so where the current buzz of Northville sex education is concerned — but we draw the line when students wishing to speak their mind are heckled.

And that's exactly what happened Tuesday night at a public forum to discuss the controversial issue. Everyone had an opinion, including a student who expressed his belief that the course needed to be taught.

Unfortunately, emotions took over Tuesday, giving some so-called adults the false impression that they had the right to interrupt and harass the student while he was throwing out his two cents' worth.

Not only is this rude, it is simply uncalled for.

Thankfully, school board president Mike Poterala stopped the meeting and made it clear that inappropriate behavior wouldn't be tolerated. It took guts to speak out to a highly charged audience and regain control

of a meeting that had begun to go off-course.

When you're talking about sex, you're talking about a myriad of issues, not the least of which deal with morality, sensitivity, education, privacy and family values. It would be foolish to think that emotions wouldn't get fired up in an environment nearly bubbling over with matters to be discussed.

But none of those things give anyone the right to intimidate another person, least of all a student.

You know, a student — the person who will ultimately be affected by the outcome of these hearings?

Apparently, some "grown-ups" believe kids don't count for much, and that any point of view deviating from their own needs to be drowned out.

We listened to the students. We can only hope others will do the same next time.

The problem is not a teacher, folks

Karla Tibble deserves a better fate.

Tibble, who teaches the health curriculum to students at Northville High School, has had to bear the brunt of irate parents who for the past few weeks have voiced displeasure over the sex education portion of the newly proposed health curriculum.

That displeasure turned ugly the past few days, despite the school board's action of removing potentially offensive portions of the sex education segment. A group of vocal parents decided to take their case to the airwaves of Detroit and by midday Tuesday, the three major television stations and two prominent AM news stations were stirring the growing controversy.

And right there in the middle, taking all the flack, was Karla Tibble.

Now I have to say, after looking at the proposed curriculum and listening to the concerns of several parents, I can understand why some parents might oppose the way in which the sex education segment was going to be taught. I'll even go a step further and make the argument that the school district might have overstepped their bounds of responsibility by the way in which they handled this sensitive subject.

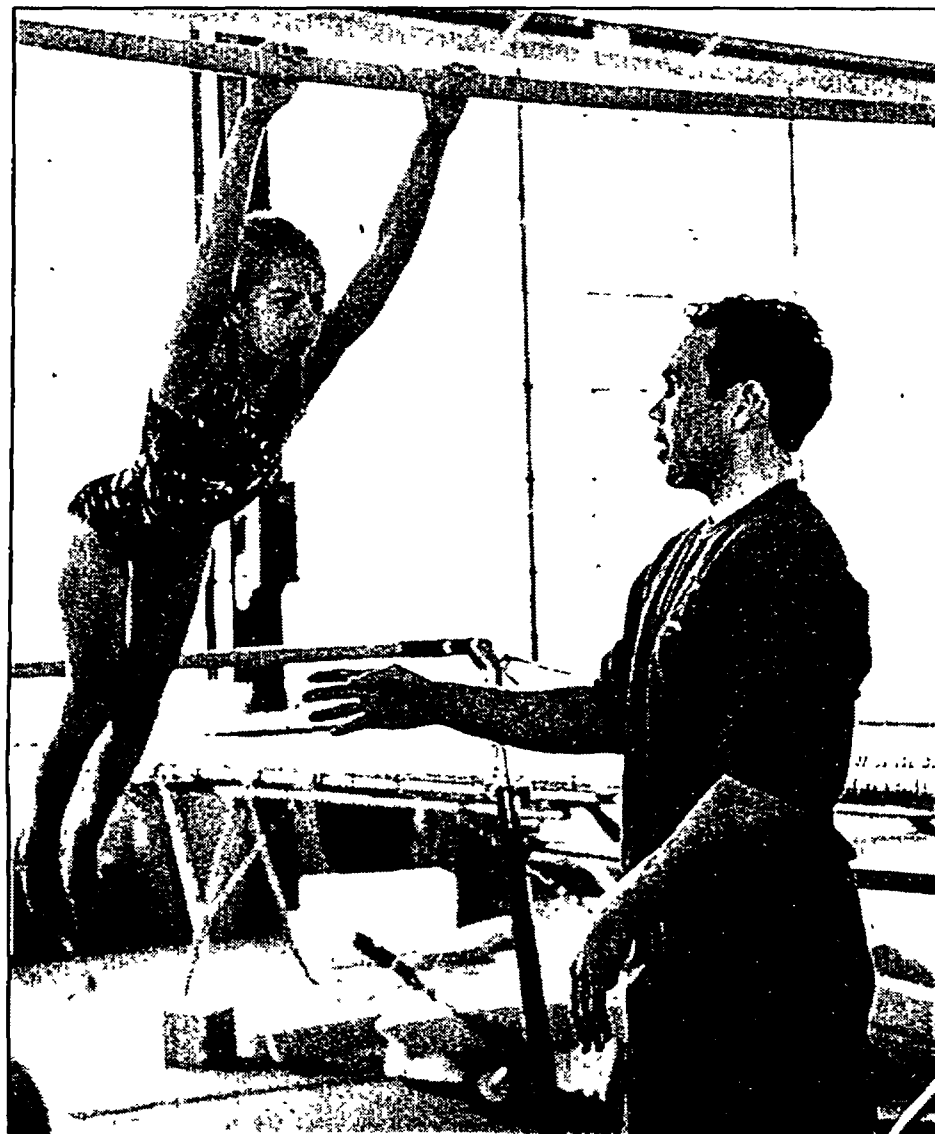

Gas prices in Michigan are currently averaging \$1.62 per gallon of regular gas at the self-serve pump, according to the United States Department of Energy. Most stations around town though are in the range of \$1.55, and that is according to AAA of Michigan. Either way, gas is expensive. The price of gas now is at the highest average in nearly twenty years, dating back to the early 1980's.

I have a close friend, a computer programmer by profession, who drives a Chevy four-wheel drive monster truck that gets about three miles to the gallon. He never hauls anything. His golf clubs would fit just as well in the trunk of any midsize car, but no, he had to have the SUV.

"It's awesome, dude," he says. "I can take this thing anywhere."

Yeah, Lodge, Chrysler and Ford Freeways, on the way back from Red Wing hockey games and club nights in Hamtramck.

I interviewed an engineer who worked for years for one of the "Big Three" on motors and electrical systems. He helped create the Moon Rover that astronauts rode on the moon. He said that the automobile companies have been working on an electric car for years. Well

A few Dems for the MEDC, if you please

I spent part of an afternoon last week down at Wayne State University, listening to the annual meeting of the board of directors of the Michigan Economic Development Corporation.

Attentive readers will recall that the MEDC was created last year as a public corporation, conformed out of the old Michigan Jobs Commission and the Michigan Manufacturing Technology Center to serve as a single responsible point of contact for all economic development activities in Michigan. No longer a department of state government (with all the attendant restrictions), the MEDC is able to function much like a private corporation, but still with state funding and legislative oversight.

Disregarding all the bureaucratic mumbo-jumbo, the bottom line is that the MEDC is widely recognized as one of the nation's most effective economic development outfits. Consider these successes:

- Competing with Ohio, MEDC helped pave the way for General Motors to put the new assembly plant for the Cadillac Catera in Lansing. GM will invest \$500 million in Michigan to create 1,511 jobs.

- When Chrysler "merged" with Daimler-Benz, a big-time issue turned on where to consolidate North American financial operations for Chrysler Financial. Daimler's operations were in Cleveland and New Jersey; Chrysler's in Auburn Hills. MEDC helped guide the consolidation to Auburn Hills, where a \$77 million investment brought with it 1,294 jobs.

- Webvan Group, Inc. is a fascinating new concept in grocery marketing, whereby folks can order their groceries — dinner, even! — on the Web and have the stuff delivered within an hour or so to their door. The Midwest distribution center for Webvan wound up in Livonia (\$47 million investment, 900 jobs) instead of Ohio, thanks to the MEDC.

- When the Robert Bosch Corporation was casting around for a place to put research and

development for the Bosch Braking Systems Corporation, MEDC jumped in and helped bring the 475 jobs and a \$37 million investment to Farmington Hills.

Not bad for a new little public corporation! As is the case with most organizations, success has more to do with effective leadership than with organizational structure and bylaws.

MEDC has been lucky to be led by Doug Rothwell, President and CEO, who used to run the Michigan Jobs Commission. Intense and slim nearly to the point of gaunt, Rothwell has steered the MEDC through the political thickets and the economic waters with great foresight. His sidekick as board chair is Rick Snyder, a quintessential no-necktie hard-charger who chucked in a career as COO of Gateway Computer and moved to Ann Arbor a few years ago, where he set up Avalon Investments, a venture capital firm.

The meeting I attended last week seemed broadly representative of this record. Snyder and Rothwell deftly moved the 60-odd board members through what looked a lot like a standard corporate agenda, including "1999 Corporate Objectives and Results" and "Strategic and Operating Plan Review."

A representative of Anderson Economic Group presented a Michigan business climate

benchmarking study that suggested Grand Rapids and (surprise!) Saginaw had the best overall business climate.

A policy agency and therefore a political creation of the Engler Administration, the MEDC is lead by a 17-member Executive Committee appointed by the Governor to eight-year staggered terms. Given the origin of the institution, it's not surprising that the current group is overwhelmingly Republican.

But now that MEDC has established a solid track record and glowing reputation and John Engler is part way through his last term as governor, it's time for folks to start thinking about how best to assure its survival under the next administration, whether Republican or Democratic.

This is not a trivial matter. The tendency in most new administrations is to trash predecessor creations, whether effective or not, on the spurious grounds of "not invented here." I saw this first hand in the 1980s, when the newly-elected Engler Administration trashed a first-class job training structure I helped organize for the Blanchard Administration, only to recreate virtually the identical set-up a couple of years later. The net effect: Wasted time and money.

The MEDC and the Engler Administration now could do succeeding administrations and countless Michigan citizens a favor by making broadly representative appointments to the MEDC Executive Committee. Better political balance at the top will provide the MEDC a fighting chance to sustain this important Michigan institution when a new administration takes power.

Another look at technology issues in schools

To the editor:

The issue of computers in schools is clearly a sensitive one, and the tone of the responses to my opinion piece ("Schools Need Fewer Computers, Not More," March 9) is a good indication of the degree of emotion and misconception involved. Ms. Nash's response is largely rhetorical, and does not address any of my four main points. She evidently feels that there is zero risk to the children, and is content to allow this educational experiment to continue. I agree, there should be alternatives that allow children to opt out of technology requirements, but this needs to be done in a way that does not stigmatize the children in an issue for the school administration. And her blithe comment that my view is somehow a test case for my Ph.D. is not only entirely incorrect, but indicates the type of personal attack that computer advocates resort to when lacking solid arguments. In fact, the real hidden agendas are more like "school prestige" or "increased real estate values" that seem to coincide with computerizing schools.

Dr. Hoffman is a bit more level-headed, and seems to grudgingly agree with some of my points that computers "cannot make kids smarter," have "potentially harmful effects," and are expensive and have a limited life.

On the other hand, he challenges my statement that there is no conclusive evidence of academic benefits. I have done the research, and I suspect Dr. Hoffman has not. If he, or anyone, has data showing substantial benefits, they should bring it forth, rather than simply stating a belief that it exists. He notes that my view is not in the mainstream, which is quite right. However, this mainstream is dominated by corporations who are looking to profit from computer technology, and a federal government more focused on short-term "global competitiveness" than on the long term well-being of children. Dr. Hoffman is concerned about the few percent of our students that do not go on to college. For them, let us implement a dedicated "vocational computer" class. And his often-claimed view that computers are "simply tools for learning" ignores the fact that they are powerful tools with far-reaching physical and psychological effects that are not understood for adults, let alone children.

There are really two levels of discussion here: one on facts, and another on values. On the factual level, the data is quite clear. Computers do not enhance academic performance, they are extremely expensive ("proper planning" notwithstanding), they take time and resources from other learning options, and they have unknown long-term consequences. Simply stating that you "disagree" with these points does not change the facts.

On the level of values, we must ask ourselves: Is this really necessary? Do we really want to incur the cost and risk for some presumed benefits?

Our children are very bright,

and our teachers are by and large outstanding.

Let them learn in the most compassionate and humane way possible through direct experience, face-to-face communication, and with time to contemplate their thoughts and actions. Why encourage dependency on high-tech tools?

Why teach them that their success in life is a function of the software that they can manipulate? In the larger course of their lives, computer skills quickly fade to irrelevance. It is their human skills that will serve them best in the future.

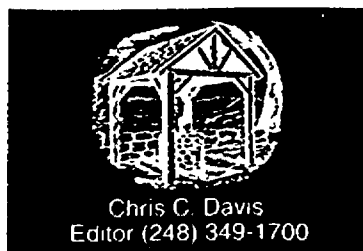

Diamond In The Rough

Find out how co-owner Mary Brady is cooking with style at Diamond Jim Brady's Bistro in Novi

Culinary awards line a back hallway in Diamond Jim Brady's Bistro in the Novi Town Center.

Proud, they are. Proud of the awards and proud of the reputation that Diamond Jim's has established over the years.

In an industry where female chefs are not prevalent, Mary Brady is a pioneer and has made a definite impact on the culinary community.

A Certified Executive Chef for 15 years now, Mary can be found in the kitchen of Diamond Jim's preparing, supervising and even delivering the food to her devoted customers.

Mary, a graduate of Michigan State University in hotel, restaurant and international management, says she always had a love for cooking and food.

"I've always enjoyed cooking," said Mary, sitting at a back table at Diamond Jim's in her white chef's shirt. "Growing up there were seven kids and I remember starting to cook as soon as I was able to reach the stove. My mom was a good cook. She cooked simple things, but good. Home made German potato salad, served hot."

And there was work to be done even before preparing the food, said Mary.

"I remember my grandfather bringing home buckets filled with perch," continued Mary, reminiscing. "I had to clean them."

Mary said that she thought about a career in another field but that cooking has always been her first love.

"Hospitality is the biggest industry in the world," said Mary, as she checked with staff about the evening preparations. "People enjoy my food and that is the biggest pleasure for me. I look at all the dishes as they come out. I love it when people say that everything was just wonderful. I get bummed when somebody is not happy."

Mary said that the design style Diamond Jim's goes back to some trips that she and her husband took to Europe.

"We went to a lot of bistros in Europe and particularly in Paris," said Mary. "And in the south of France. It's an authentic bistro style."

The restaurant definitely looks like an authentic bistro and it is hard to tell that it is actually connected to a mall. The classic style give off a feel that is relaxing and comforting. But it took a lot of hard work to get to where she is today.

Mary's beginning, like most cooks, starts at the lower-rung jobs. She worked at a restaurants in the kitchens and took classes in kitchen management and food ethics courses. At one point, the suggestion came that she sold get her certification.

Once certification is reached, a CEC must take a written test retain certification. The test revolves around nutrition, personal supervision and sanitation.

The American Culinary Federation (ACF) is the nation's largest professional association of pastry chefs, chefs and cooks.

Of the 2,327 CEC in the United States, only 137 are women. Women are still a minority in the business.

"Back in the 1970's there was only one certified chef," said Mary.

Mary takes her business serious, and it shows. Mary says the restaurant business is something that isn't for everyone. Late night closings and clean ups are just part of the business.

"This is a team effort," said Mary. "From the bartenders, cooks and hostesses there is everybody being committed to doing a good job."

Mary said that she would rather be working or at home, when it comes to distributing her time.

"I hate standing in lines," said

Gateway to hell

Johnny Depp plays rare book broker in devilish mystery, 'The Ninth Gate'

Dean Corso (Johnny Depp) is a New York book broker who specializes in tracking down rare and exotic volumes for well-heeled collectors. Corso brings to his work a breadth of knowledge, a direct manner and a keen eye.

He also brings to it an essentially cold-blooded, amoral nature; to help himself, Corso will not hesitate to trick an under-educated owner into selling him a valuable four-volume edition of Don Quixote for next to nothing.

Corso's mercenary ethos makes him the preferred book detective of the urbane publisher Boris Balkan (Frank Langella), whose climate-controlled library is entirely devoted to books about the Devil, and who has an unusual assignment for Corso.

Balkan has recently acquired a long-coveted, seventeenth-century satanic text called "The Nine Gates of the Kingdom of the Shadows" from a fellow collector, Andrew Telfer, who committed suicide the very next day.

The book is illustrated with nine engravings that, when properly interpreted and combined with the original text, are said to summon the Devil and open the entrance to the Underworld. Published in 1666, it was adapted by its Venetian author, Aristide Torchia, from a legendary book written by Satan himself, a transgression for which the Holy Inquisition burned Torchia at the stake.

Three copies of "The Nine Gates" survived, but Balkan is certain that something is wrong with his edition; he suspects that only one of the three editions is authentic. He offers Corso a hefty fee to seek out the two remaining volumes in Portugal and France and compare them against his. Corso, who believes in cash, not the devil, accepts the job.

With "The Nine Gates" in his possession, Corso soon finds himself at the center of strange and violent goings-on. Not only is his apartment ransacked, it appears

that he is being shadowed by the striking, mysterious blond Girl (Emmanuelle Seigner) he first noticed at a demonology lecture given by Balkan.

And, though Telfer's beautiful French-born widow Liana (Lena Olin) initially expresses only mild surprise regarding her husband's sale of "The Nine Gates," she soon has a change of heart and becomes ferociously determined to regain the book.

Corso stashes "The Nine Gates" with his friend Bernie (James Russo), a rare book dealer. The book is safe at Bernie's shop, but Bernie himself is not: when Corso goes to retrieve the volume, he discovers his friend hanging upside down in a pose identical to an engraved illustration in "The Nine Gates."

The stunned Corso calls Balkan to quit, but the collector exponentially ups the financial ante. At the same time, the broker's curiosity is aroused when he hears flight announcements emanating from his client's undisclosed location. It seems Balkan is on his way to Europe, as well.

Corso's first stop is Toledo, Spain, where the Telfer edition was purchased from the book-binders/dealers the Centza brothers (Jose Lopez Rodero). The two chatty brothers are a fountain of information about "The Nine Gates" and the paths it has traveled over three centuries.

They tell the skeptical Corso that Aristide Torchia collaborated on the book with Satan himself, and also reveal that Liana Telfer badgered her indifferent husband into buying it for her. Insisting on the book's authenticity, the brothers point out a significant detail in one of its nine engravings: It is signed "LCF," which they claim stands for "Lucifer."

Outside the store, Corso has an encounter with some metal scaffolding that corresponds quite eerily to the message of that same engraving.

Circumstances grow more bizarre in Portugal, where Corso travels to examine the copy of "The Nine Gates" owned by Victor Fargas (Jack Taylor), the gracious scion of a formerly wealthy family.

Pouring over the Balkan and Fargas editions, Corso discovers unexpected discrepancies in three of the engravings, with one set signed with the author's initials "AT," and the other "LCF." Corso

no sooner steps outside Fargas's gates than an attempt is made on his life, perhaps by the sinister-looking bodyguard (Tony Amos) Corso glimpsed on the grounds of Liana Telfer's mansion.

Corso returns to his hotel to find the Girl reading in the lounge, the second time he has crossed paths with her in Europe. She is playfully evasive but seems to know a great deal about "The Nine Gates"

and the people pursuing it. It is the Girl who tells Corso to return to Fargas' estate, where he finds the old man lying dead in a pond, and the "The Nine Gates" smoldering in the fireplace, robbed of its

engravings. Ultimately it is the Girl, revealed at last as an agent of the devil, who decides whether the secrets of "The Nine Gates" will be unlocked — and to whom.

How far will they go to get the girls of their dreams?

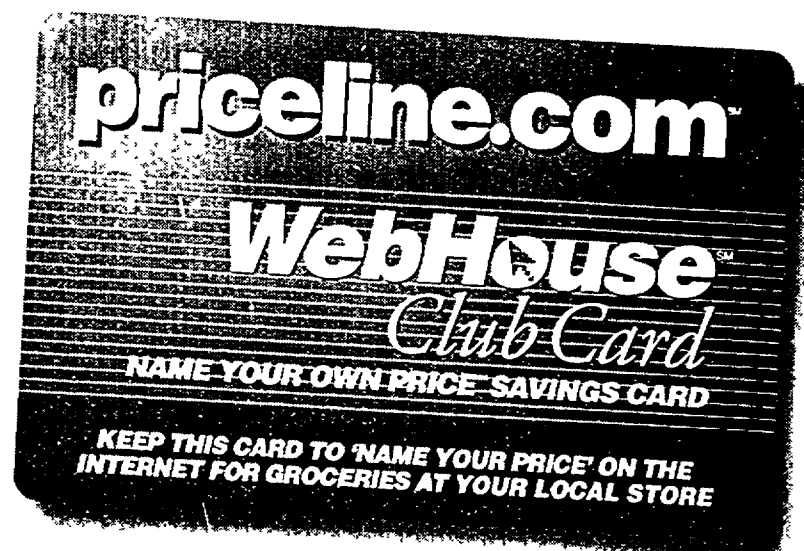

Familiar faces

Hasse's make HomeTown's all-area volleyball team, again

To hear some tell it, volleyball in the area is down. That may be based on post-season performance, which would fail to see the big picture. Northville and South Lyon were in the same district as state quarterfinalist Plymouth Salem, not to mention Livonia Ladywood. Novi was in the same district as Walled Lake Central, enough said. And the rest of the KVC was feeding off its own in the Brighton district.

The talent, it's still there. Milford coach Jim Marszalek said he'd put up a KVC all-star team against any league in the state. Well, if he's willing to trade some Livingston County players for the Hasse twins, here's his chance.

Meredith Hasse Northville senior

Quite possibly one of the best players to ever grace the volleyball courts at Northville High School. The senior captain was a great leader on and off the court in leading Northville to a highly-successful third-place finish in the always-tough Western Lakes conference.

The middle hitter led the team with 354 kills and 163 blocks this season, and she also led the Mustangs with 41 service aces. She was one of just seven players selected to the all-conference team, which consists of schools such as Plymouth Salem, Walled Lake Central, and Livonia Franklin and Churchill. Her skills on the court led to her place on the all-

region squad while her 4.0 grade point average earned her a spot on the all-region academic team. She was voted as the most-valuable player by her teammates and will be attending U of M on an academic scholarship next year.

"I think she's got the talent to play at Michigan next year," her coach and former South Lyon and Western Michigan standout Nikki McEvers said. "Usually when you get to girls six foot and over they begin to slow down. But Meredith's quick on her feet and can get to almost any ball."

Kristen McGlennen Novi senior

Despite the fact that many teams tried to hit away from this three-year letterwinner, she still mustered up 183 total blocks this season for Novi. Many of those, 136 to be exact, were of the solo variety.

Her block total was tops in the area, as was her 65 service aces this season. She also had 207 kills to help her on her way to being named to the Kensington Valley Conference first team. Her accolades also carried her to the all-region squad as well.

"She's a very hard worker," her coach Julie Fiset said. "She's never satisfied with mediocrity. She worked hard in the offseason with her training and AAU ball. You could tell when she was on the court how dominant she was."

McGlennen is awaiting acceptance to Columbia University, but has also received scholarship offers to both Rutgers and Lehigh.

Janel Hasse Northville senior

It should come as no surprise that often times if Meredith Hasse wasn't the best player on the court, her twin-sister Janel was. Janel Hasse's numbers are very similar to that of her sister's. She had 329 kills for the season to go along with 140 blocks and 40 aces. Each of those numbers were second best on the team.

"She's right up there with her sister," McEvers said. "Meredith was the one that kept the team on track and Janel is the one that keeps everyone happy."

Hasse's best attribute was her tremendous hitting power and her ability to hit the backset well.

"She also knows the game very well, and could always anticipate where the ball would be hit," McEvers said.

The senior was an all-division selection in the Western Lakes and was also all-region and all-region academic.

Fran Hamilton South Lyon senior

South Lyon runs a star system, and this season the onus was on Hamilton. She was up to the task. A first-team all-area choice last year, as a senior Hamilton, Howell's Ashley Howard and Brighton's Julie Stowers were the closest things to a dominant player in the KVC. She concluded her career as one of the best players in school history. Hamilton had 399 kills, which is just 10 short of the single-season record set last year by Kelle Kern. Her 860 career kills are the second-most in school

Gillis lands on HomeTown's second team

Beth Gillis Northville senior

At 6-foot-4, Gillis is the tallest person on either of this year's all-area teams. Thanks in part to her size, she was a force in the front row for Northville this season.

Playing alongside the Hasse twins, Gillis forced the opponents hands and game plans when they matched up against Northville. Her 117 kills gave Northville three with 100-plus attacks and she was also third on the team with 115 blocks and 27 service aces.

She earned honorable mention

honors in the Western Lakes conference.

"She was the person who got 'em going out there," Northville coach Nikki McEvers said. "With her and Janel blocking in the front, teams couldn't pass us well. And she also played really well in the back row."

Christie Schumacher Milford senior

Schumacher traded AAU basketball for varsity volleyball and, despite perhaps not having as firm an understanding of the game as her opponents and not playing the

back line, she was still All-KVC. What she lacked in technique, Schumacher made up for in athletic ability. Her 155 blocks were the most on the team, and the second-best mark in the conference.

"Christie intimidated players at the net, she did a great job blocking," Milford coach Jim Marszalek said. "Sometimes she didn't get the block, but the other team tried to hit around her and that made it much easier for the back row."

Schumacher's 244 kills were also the most on the team. Her hitting percentage was .296

Annie Charles Milford junior

A spot contributor on the varsity as a sophomore, this year Charles became one of the Redskins' most dependable players, and will be their top outside hitter next year. Playing on the same front row with Christie Schumacher, she still wound up with 116 kills.

"She was one of our better passers and defenders on the back row," Milford coach Jim Marszalek said. "Annie's not flashy. She's solid, she doesn't get rattled. She's a smart player. When a bad play was going down, she'd put the ball

in the right place."

Beth Berry South Lyon junior

For the first month of the season, South Lyon struggled to find itself, as players adapted to new roles and each other. Lions coach Ed Baldwin said it finally clicked when Berry became the team's full-time setter. South Lyon's prolific offense, with Fran Hamilton and Cassey Sutton collecting the fat stats, all ran through Berry, who led the team in assists, and the team ended up in second-place in the KVC. While setting

isn't the most glorified job, coaches, of course, recognize its indispensability. Which is why they selected Berry to the KVC's all-league team.

Allison Wise Lakeland senior

Wise became Lakeland's most consistently good player in coach Aimee Nardell's first season, one which lay the groundwork for a program that looks to be coming around. Wise led the Eagles in both kills and blocks. Wise was the Eagles' sole representative on the KVC all-league team.

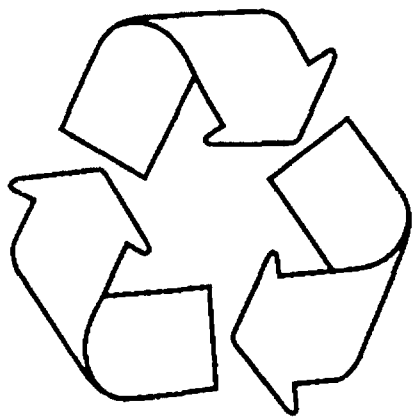
"There were points in some games where Erica just dominated," Milford coach Jim Marszalek said.

Health Column

Look what's just around the corner

Did you feel the summer sampler last week? With record warm temperatures, many of us shed our thicker winter clothing for our skimpier shorts, T-shirts and summer blouses. When you looked in the mirror, what response did this bring for you? For many, it was something like this...ahhh! I need to get in better shape for summer - now.

Memorial Day is about 60 days from press time of this column. This day marks the official start of hopefully a few months of summer fun. We thought we would attempt to assist those of you wanting to not only look better in those shorts and bathing suits this year, but to get the most out of the summer activities with the least amount of aches, pains and possible injuries.

I have been around the fitness business a long time and I realize I have probably already lost a lot of readers by now. Oh, they were saying to themselves, "I don't have any time for any exercise or fitness things," or "I tried exercise before and never got any real results," or "I don't have to do any of the stuff this guy is going to talk about, I heard on the radio I can lose weight and tone while I sleep and eat anything I want by taking this magic formula before bed." For those brave souls who have read this far and in light of the fact everyone is so busy, I have listed the top six tips you can do from now to Memorial Day in under one-half hour per day to look and feel better and enjoy your summer more fuller with minimum aches, pains and injuries.

Of course, these suggestions are for the average person with no serious health problems or past injuries. If you are not sure this is you, seek a medical review to assure you are ready to begin a fitness program.

• **Get into some cardiovascular training.** This is key. get moving now. Three-four days of the week you should spend your 20-30 minutes of what I call "time for you" doing some kind of cardiovascular exercise. This could be jogging, swimming, bicycling, etc.

Due to the weather, many of us have to look inside, either at home equipment or at a health club. Find what is right for you and look for variety to assure you don't get bored. Also, start slow but move up to a good intensity. Activities like walking the dog (while much better than nothing), usually does not allow us to get our heart rate high enough to burn enough body fat.

• **Start some type of resistance training.** Two days a week you should spend your 20 to

30 minutes doing some type of resistance training. You can use your body weight, tubing or more traditional weights for the resistance. If you start a program to lose weight and skip this component, your body will use your valuable lean muscle for energy. While you may indeed lose weight, you will be getting less toned and less healthy since the weight is coming from water and lean muscle. I could go on and on about the value of this step, benefits like stopping or reversing osteoporosis, or the fact we burn body fat within our lean muscle. We call lean muscle our "fat burning machinery." Whatever method you decide is right for you, add this step but find the proper instruction to make sure you are training safely.

We have a program using tubing that takes about 20 minutes, can be done at home and involves about a \$60 investment. (which includes the tubing equipment and a one-hour instruction session).

• **Begin some flexibility training.** Many people after a long winter of inactivity or hibernation hit the golf courses come first sign of warmer weather and play 18 holes and wonder why their back or shoulders are sore. Start now to use five minutes of your time a couple days a week to stretch. Like anything else, there is a safe way to do this. Seek out some guidance and start now, your body will be much more ready for activity.

• **Drink six-eight glasses of water a day.** This takes virtually no time and can really make a difference in your overall health. I could easily fill this entire column with the many benefits of making this lifestyle change, but for the sake of space, let me sum it up this way.

Our bodies are about 60-70 percent water. Are you giving your body a fresh supply or is it running on the same water from months ago? Oh, and even though pop and coffee have water

in them, these are dehydrates. In fact, for every cup of coffee you drink, you need to add one more glass of water.

• **• Eat less per meal but eat more often.** Do not do what many of us do when we panic about our shape, stop eating. While fasting may have its place on occasion, you need to eat every three-four hours per day. Make better food choices and cut back on the amount, but eat more often. This keeps your blood sugar stabilized, keeps your energy up and fuels your body to burn body fat. If through activity and slightly reducing our food intake (maybe cutting out those two or three cookies or potato chips), you could create a 500 calorie deficit. That is, burning 500 more calories than you are taking in, this would allow you to lose about a pound to a pound and one-half a week. In other words, about 10-15 pounds of body fat by Memorial Day. Don't get hung up on all this carbohydrate or fat amounts at this point. We are moving less today and eating about 300 calories more per day, that is why we are not in the shape we want. It is not solely the fault of carbohydrates or fats. You can gain weight by eating the whole bag of cookies or potato chips even if they are fat free.

• **Take a good multi-vitamin daily.** You were probably not eating three to five servings of fruit and vegetables per day before you wanted to get in better shape. As you attempt to increase your activity and reduce your food intake, you will place even more demand to assure you are receiving the proper nutrients. A good multi-vitamin will accomplish this.

One extra hint. Stop looking for and wasting money on short cuts to a healthier, better looking body. Do you really think we can eat what we want, have no activity and take a potion to get the body we want? The answer is and always has been a combination of the above six steps.

Take the next 60 days one day at a time. Commit the 20-30 minutes per day of "time for you" - you deserve it. If you fall off the program, get back on it and start again. Use the hints above and you will have a safer, fuller and fun summer. Good luck.

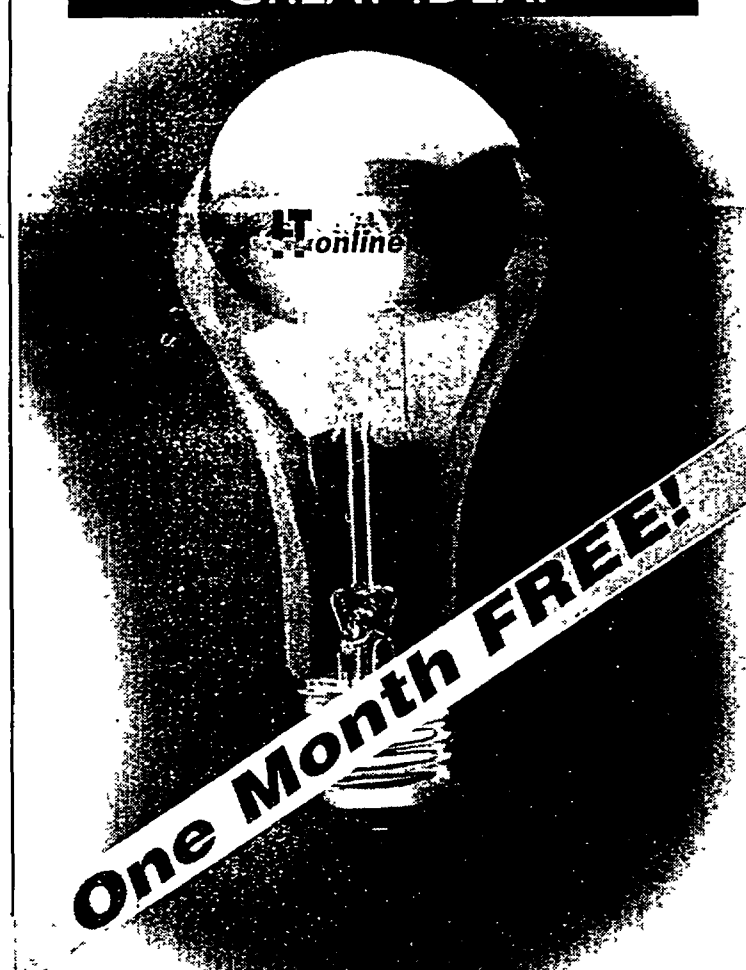

HOW TO Make grout gleam

Q. I found your column interesting regarding the cleaning and restoration of grout on a tile floor. My problem is with the tile on my shower wall, which is black in spots and dingy. I have tried general cleaners without success. Do you have any recommendations?

A. This is a common problem, and the process of cleaning and restoring stained grout in wall tiles is not much different than the process for floor tiling. However, I am happy to repeat some recommendations along with some new product information that might prove helpful.

Grout is porous and easily stained by dirt, mildew, soap scum and hard-water deposits. Stains that deeply penetrate the surface are often permanent. However, start by thoroughly cleaning your tile and the grout joints. The Tile Council of America recommends applying a thick paste of scouring powder and hot water. Apply like a poultice, and let stand for five to 10 minutes. Rinse. If the staining remains, apply undiluted bleach for at least five minutes, rinse well.

If this fails to lighten and brighten your grout, it doesn't necessarily mean that the grout has to be replaced. Assuming that the grout is in good condition (not crumbling or cracked), you can recoat the stained grout with a Tile Grout Coating from Homax Products. This is an expanding polymer liquid that soaks deep into the grout to hide the stains and produce a watertight protective seal. It is available in bright white and five colors, and it comes in a small squeeze bottle with a sponge applicator tip.

Just apply the coating on the stained grout joints. You should plan on treating the grout lines in the entire shower enclosure to assure a consistent color match. Allow to dry, then buff the tiles with a clean cotton or terry cloth towel to remove any residue that remains on the tiles.

This Old Salt

This Milford home was built in 1881 but feels like an 18th century original

It's not every day that you build a replica 18th century salt box home. But not everyone is as determined as Milford resident, Ayesha Lancaster, who's decided to build one since there were none available. After getting plans from an architect in a small town in Maine, she searched for subcontractors. The result was like a step back in time to 18th century England in a quiet rural setting. Even the garage blends with the surrounding home, looking like an 18th century barn.

When building in 1981, there was a slight building

recession, and contractors were anxious to work. They were also intrigued to build a home that was not a run of the mill, according to Ayesha Lancaster.

"It was such a thrill for them to do something different. It made their work exciting again," she said.

When it came to an addition seven years later, the same crew came back to add on a master bath and bed to the first floor, which made for continuity throughout the home.

Some of the details were easy. Marvin windows provided the great eight over twelve windows with

wood mullions through the glass. The floors throughout the home are 1 x 12 pine boards, which have aged to a warm glow after almost twenty years. And some of the accents were more difficult to come by such as the hardware, which was all cast by a local blacksmith, including door hinges, latches and sash pins for the windows.

Ayesha's use of primitive antiques provides an interior setting that's true to its style. A lifelong antiquer, her mother sparked her interest with her first

antique at the age of 12. It a copper coffee pot that sits near the fireplace.

Unique collections are found throughout the house. These include baskets hanging from the beams rafters. Mammy dolls, candles and quilts as well as a number of antique and reproduction samplers accent the surroundings. About twenty canning crocks in different shapes, sizes and glazes are found throughout her

shelves. Some with handles, some without. She explains they all have a "tip" that indicate where to seal the jar with paraffin. Many items have been passed down from her mother.

"I tend to like family things," she said pointing out the samplers as well as a favorite silver tea set she received from her namesake, Grandma Ayesha.

Many of the antiques have a story behind, such as a quilt made by Margaret Muir's

mother. Her mother was given the quilt one day while she was picking raspberries. Another circa 1870 quilt is rumored to be made by Harriet Beecher Stowe.

Although work islands are found in the kitchens of contemporary homes, Ayesha does hers with a twist. Hers is a large antique counter found in a general store. The actual sink and bins are riveted shut on one side. The sink and dishwasher are built into the counter. No other cupboard space

is built in except for a stepback cupboard.

In the center of the living area is an open, step-in fireplace with a four-foot flue in the chimney. Here the blacksmith contributed the fireplace tools, shovels and plects as well as the crane inside. The fireplace is centrally located, typical of Connecticut salt boxes.

Although Ayesha appreciates the heritage of the past, she's made some concessions to modern comfort. Track lighting in

the living area makes reading easier, a pool out back is a great relief on warm summer days. A private bathroom off the master bedroom with it's step up tub, has today's luxuries. Even here she can't resist blending in some of her antiques. The bathroom cupboard is a Michigan sink and a large bread board provides the counter surface.

The public enjoyed the unique home during last year's Milford Home Tour.

Grimy grout comes clean

Q. We moved into an older home with plaster walls that are chalking. I tried washing them down with TSP (trisodium phosphate), but they still continue to be dusty. I want to paint the entire interior of the house. Do you have any recommendations regarding this condition and what might be done prior to painting?

A. To rescue powdering plaster walls, try washing them with a solution of one pint of white household vinegar diluted in 1 gallon of water. Repeated washings may harden the surface enough to hold spackle and paint and save you from an expensive replastering job.

Q. I read your column regarding the problem of picture shadows left on wood paneling when framed pictures were removed or rearranged. My problem is with a painted wall. When I want to remove several framed pictures, I found a yellow cast on the wall beneath, which is quite obvious when compared with the surrounding wall color. What causes this, and what is the remedy?

A. The remedy is a new coat of paint. This yellowing condition is most noticeable in aging white paints. It's caused by oxidation of alkyl or oil-based paints and is most prevalent in areas that lack light, i.e., behind pictures or appliances, inside closets, etc. Heat from stoves, radiators and heating ducts is also a source of the problem.

According to the Rohm and Haas Paint Quality Institute, the solution is to use top-quality latex paints that do not tend to yellow with age. Alkyl paints, because of their curing mecha-

nism, do tend to yellow, particularly in areas that are protected from sunlight. For information on other paint problems and solutions, consumers can find the Paint Quality Institute on the Web at www.paintquality.com.

Q. My bar glasses have become very cloudy. I have tried every cleaner I am familiar with. How can they be cleaned?

A. Usually this type of cloudy film is due to chemical deposits from your water source. Since chemicals and minerals in the water vary from area to area, effective cleaning methods vary. There are several cleaning methods that might work.

Fill the glasses with water, and drop in a denture cleaning tablet such as Polident. Let soak overnight.

Heat a solution of white household vinegar diluted in some water, and let the glasses soak in this overnight.

Using plain hydrogen peroxide, available at your drug store, can also soften hard water stains. The best commercial products I know of for this type of stain removal are: CLR (Jelmar, 6600 N. Lincoln Ave., Lincolnwood, IL 60465) and De-Solv-It (Orange-Sol Inc., Gilbert, Ariz., phone: (602) 497-8822). Both products are readily available in supermarkets and home centers. But if they unavailable in your area, contact the manufacturer directly.

Massage anyone?

New massage therapist joins downtown Northville

For Kelly Gee, finding herself in downtown Northville in the middle of this winter would have been far fetched as recent as two years ago.

But as far fetched as it might have seemed, that's exactly where she's at today.

The occupational and massage therapist recently teamed up with Dr. Kenneth Stopa at their new office, located at 109 W. Main next to Urban Optiks and Joseph's Coney Island in the downtown area. use a big bag of tricks," Gee said.

Although she has been in business for just two months, she's happy with the response she's received from customers.

"I wanted to be up to full schedule in two months, but that's just me," she said. "I'm very flexible. I can stay late or come in early."

Gee also offers Yoga classes out of her office on Tuesday nights. She spent seven years studying Iyengar Yoga when she was in Idaho. She wants to keep the classes small, but would like to expand the number of classes she can offer.

"I want to give a lot of individual attention," she said. "I'm a stickler for proper alignment."

Gee hopes to add a Thursday morning Yoga class if the response is there.

"I enjoy it, so it's not a burden," she said.

KNOCKOUT PUNCH

Sneak power foods into diet for extra nutrition

Surprise! Starving yourself is bad for you. So, coincidentally, are a good deal of the diets that have crashed, then burned, onto the scene of late.

Louder and stronger comes the voice of reason: a consistent, well-balanced diet and regular exercise are the healthiest ways to lose weight.

That established, how can you ensure you're getting everything you need while counting calories? There are dozens of foods out there, most recently being referred to as "power foods," that do just that - pack a wallop without tacking on extra pounds.

The trick is not only finding them, but smuggling them into your diet with enough regularity - and taste - to reap the benefits.

Christine Palumbo, a registered dietitian in private practice, who is also an adjunct faculty member in the Benedictine University Nutrition Program in Illinois, has experimented in this area not only with clients, but on her own family of five.

"Incorporate them into other foods," she said. "Then you're adding all the minerals, vitamins and fiber into a main dish. That's one way of incorporating it. The other thing is, you don't want that food to be the showcase, you want it to be something on the side - it should be, 'Oh, by the way. ...'"

"When I make vegetable soup, I turn it into a minestrone. You can also mash beans and use them to thicken soups and sauces. Just don't make a big deal out of it. I personally don't like sneaking things in, but it's more of a subtle thing."

Some power foods are good enough to eat by themselves anyway. Palumbo's list includes broccoli, fat-free (skim) milk, orange juice, legumes, oatmeal, spinach and whole-wheat bread - all things that are regularly found in an average family pantry anyway.

The following 10 items, which in no way comprise an exhaustive list, all made the International Food Information Council Foundation's Functional Foods listing as foods that go beyond providing basic nutrition.

1. Broccoli: A nutrient-dense vegetable, broccoli is rich in vitamin C, fiber, water (an oft-underestimated necessity), potassium, folic acid and phytochemicals, which help fend off heart disease and some forms of cancer.

All at 22 calories for 1/2 cup of the cooked version.

2. Fat-free milk: As much as one-third of the recommended daily amount of calcium can come from an 8-ounce serving of fat-free milk, with only 90 calories. Then throw in vitamin D (which the body needs to utilize calcium), protein and riboflavin for free.

3. Oatmeal: "My first choice is the least processed, the old-fashioned oats that cook in three minutes," Palumbo said. "The more natural the form, the healthier it is."

Oatmeal has a type of soluble fiber, beta glucan, which helps lower blood cholesterol and smooths out the peaks and valleys of blood sugar, a helpful thing for people trying to lose weight.

"It forms a gel in your stomach, and stays with you a long time," Palumbo said. "The other thing is, it's so inexpensive, especially if you're eating the old-fashioned kind, that vs. dry cereal you're eating for pennies."

4. Beans or legumes: Another fiber-rich item, beans are also a good protein source, something to consider now that diets high in meats are held in such low regard these days.

"Current research is showing we need to move more to a plant-based diet," Palumbo said. "The majority of a person's calories should come from plant-based foods."

According to Liz Applegate, nutrition editor for Runner's World magazine, and a teacher at the University of California-Davis, lentil beans go even farther. They are rich in iron, potassium and folate.

"This last ingredient may be lentils' biggest contribution of all, as folate is crucial for the production of new

cells, especially the millions of blood cells made daily," Applegate wrote in her column.

5. Whole-wheat bread: Here's a gimme - whole-wheat breads have been talked up for years as beneficial for their source of fiber. There's more to it, though: whole grains have been shown to reduce the risk of diabetes. They temper the cholesterol level, keep us full longer, and reduce the risk of death to such things as heart disease and some cancers. Some necessary trace minerals are also found in whole-wheat bread, and the same can be said for other grains on the list.

6. Bulgur: A whole-wheat kernel that's been cracked. Bulgur can be cooked like rice, and incorporated into dishes like stuffed peppers.

7. Brown rice: The outside husk of rice is the part with most of the minerals attached to it, and though brown rice takes twice as long to cook as white rice, the benefit from the trace minerals is worth it.

8. Orange juice: Vitamin C, OJ's most recognizable commodity, isn't the only thing that makes it worth reaching for. As the talking sandwich in the fridge will tell you, orange juice is a good source of folic acid, which women of childbearing age need. It's also being shown to reduce the risk of heart disease, and is, of course, an

excellent source of fluids. Calcium-fortified orange juice can give those who can't stomach milk a means of keeping their bones strong.

9. Spinach and cabbage: With 21 calories per 1/2 cup of spinach, Popeye gets 3 grams of protein, as well as a good source of fiber that is extremely high in vitamin A, and high in the B vitamins. It is also rich in folic acid.

Cabbage has only nine calories per 1/2 cup, and is another source of vitamin C, potassium and the B vitamins.

10. Sweet potatoes: Rounding off the top 10, sweet potatoes are high in vitamin A.

"A really good lunch is a microwaved sweet potato," Palumbo said. "It's filling, sweet and delicious."

When baked, the average potato is 120 calories. For that paltry sum, you get complex carbohydrates, fiber, vitamin A, some vitamin C, potassium and other phytochemicals.

Keep in mind if and when choosing to add these things to a regular diet, that man does not live by whole-grain bread alone.

"There is no magic bullet," Palumbo said. "There are no good and bad foods, only good and bad diets. Just as eating an average-size candy bar is not going to make a bad diet, eating bad all day and eating a power food at dinner is not going to make a good diet."

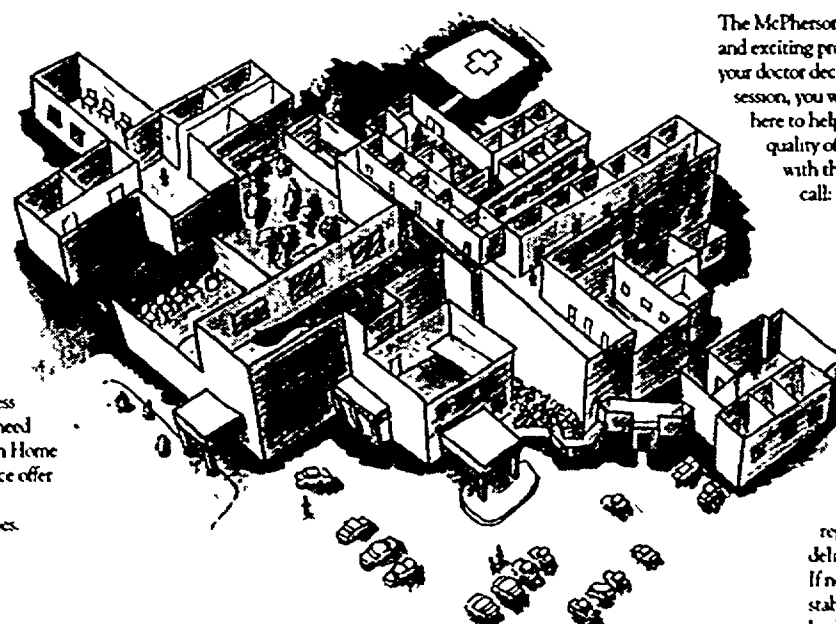

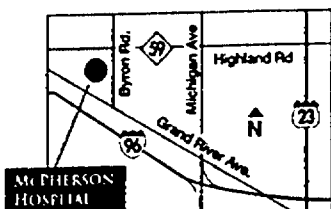

Searching for a good night's sleep

"One-third of life is passed in sleeping," said the poet Byron.

Not so for those in the grip of insomnia, and their numbers are legion.

More than half (56 percent) of American adults report experiencing symptoms of insomnia a few nights a week or more, according to the 1999 Sleep in America survey from the National Sleep Foundation.

The foundation defines insomnia as characterized by "difficulty falling asleep, waking frequently during the night, waking too early in the morning and not being able to get back to sleep, and waking feeling unrefreshed."

Any combination of symptoms may be experienced.

What the definition doesn't detail is the frustration, panic and even paranoia that the hapless "sleeper" experiences. There are Catch-22s to insomnia: the harder you try to sleep, the more you writhe; the more you try to relax, the more anxious you become; the more sheep you count, the wider awake you feel - until the alarm goes off.

Insomnia's probably always been with us, according to Anne Remmes, a neurologist at the Sleep Disorders Center of Columbia-Presbyterian Medical Center in New York City.

"There's a tendency to inherit a particular sleep pattern, it's part of our genes," said Remmes, who is board certified in sleep medicine. For women, hormonal changes during pre-menstruation, pregnancy and menopause, can cause insomnia. "Fragile sleepers," individuals who are not able to wind down easily, are also vulnerable.

Today's hard-driving society may make insomnia more of a problem, since stresses - positive as well as negative - can trig-

ger bouts of sleeplessness. If you have a period of insomnia that doesn't subside after a couple of weeks, "the fear of insomnia becomes the stress," Remmes said. It's self-perpetuating.

So, what should a cranky, sleep-deprived mortal do?

A first step is to recognize what not to do - the common errors sleep experts say desperate folks make to catch some ZZZs.

- Take a nap.

"With insomnia, it's a bad idea to nap," said Remmes. It affects your ability to sleep at night.

- Wind down with a couple of drinks before bedtime.

Alcohol acts on the central nervous system as a depressant. When it wears off

in the middle of the night, activity in the central nervous system increases and you're wide awake.

- Climb in bed and watch television.

"Bed is for sex and sleeping," Remmes said. Don't watch television right before bedtime, but you can read an interesting book - sitting in a chair. "The hour before sleep, do something engaging that turns off the analytical brain."

- Go to bed earlier than usual.

"This is a major myth," said Remmes. "People think, 'If I'm not falling asleep, I should lengthen the sleep time.' It doesn't work."

- Trouble going to sleep or waking in the night? Try to relax and go to sleep.

Get up and read, is the experts' advice.

Don't stay in bed tossing and turning.

- Take a sleeping pill.

"Pills are not the answer," Remmes said. They don't work over time.

- If you wake up, check the clock.

"Don't have a clock you can see in the dark. This is an arousal system," she said. "If the alarm hasn't gone off, it's not time for you to activate."

For those whose bouts with insomnia are few, avoiding these myths may be enough to get back into a regular sleep pattern.

If any sleeping problem persists for longer than a week, though, it's a good idea to talk to a physician, according to the NSF.

With insomnia, "your sleep system is broken. What you need to do is fix the system," Remmes said. At the Sleep Disorders Center, this is done by enforcing a regular sleep/wake schedule. You go to bed and get up at a set time, even on weekends.

The Sleep Disorders Center maintains an outpatient program that has treated thousands of patients, each on a one-to-one basis. For the first two to three weeks, the sleep cycle is shortened to 5 1/2 to six hours. Then, when the patient is sleeping well, bedtime is expanded in 15-minute increments.

"Studies show that as a general rule, most people require about eight hours sleep," Remmes said. Consequently, this regimen initially has patients sleep-deprived and uncomfortable. "It's very organized and very hard and it works very well."

For those who can take the bull by the horns, acknowledge they'll be miserable for two weeks, but say, "I can do it," 80 percent do extraordinarily well, Remmes said.

The end result is individuals who confidently look forward to the sleep that refreshes, climb into bed and say, "Good night" to the day.

Healthy travel, dieting and massage therapy

Traveling, whether for business or pleasure, used to mean an escape from work, stress and exercise. These days, traveling is exhausting, and since more of us enjoy working out and eating right, we appreciate any opportunity to stay in shape while we're on the road.

With a little advance planning, travelers can keep fit wherever their journeys take them:

To minimize muscle stiffness and fatigue that can accompany long car or plane trips, take frequent breaks. If driving, take advantage of rest stops to walk briskly for 10 or 15 minutes. Get similar benefits on an airplane by walking up and down the aisle a few times.

Soothe a tired neck by rolling it slowly in a controlled, circular motion. Alternate the circular pattern with up-and-down shoulder "shrug" movements.

Book a hotel with a gym. Ask what kind of equipment is available. Also, ask about fitness classes and make advanced reservations if they are required.

Remember to pack on-the-road fitness essentials such as running shoes and exercise togs. Other workout items might include a headset, a favorite workout tape, resistance bands, light weights and a fitness video.

When all else fails, get creative with your workout. You can climb stairs, swim laps at the hotel pool, power walk through town or rent a pair of skates.

Win Some, Lose a Lot

People who repeatedly go on and off crash diets actually gain weight over time. Weight control is a learned behavior and takes more than will power - it takes practice. The best commercial diet programs focus on smart food choices. No plan is perfect, but the good ones all have the following features in common:

- They recommend food that is low in fat and sugar, high in complex carbohydrates, such as breads and vegetables.

- They teach you how to shop for and prepare low-fat meals that are quick and easy to make.

- Include an adequate supply of vitamins and minerals.

- Ask you to eat at least 1,100 calories a day.

- Allow you to eat a variety of foods and even foods you like in moderation.

- Encourage new eating habits and exercise.

- Teach you to gain the edge on hunger with simple tips like sipping broth-based soups, drinking plenty of

water or munching on raw vegetables before meals.

There's the Rub

All massage is not created equal. The loving touch of a friend or spouse has the power to relieve stress and calm the senses.

Here are a few suggestions for massaging like a pro:

- If massage includes the use of oils, remember to warm them in the palm of the hand to avoid the shock of coolness to the skin.

- Use long strokes, gently gliding palms over the skin.

- Knead muscles by rolling and pressing your partner's muscles in both hands. Be sensitive to whether more or less pressure is desired.

- Use the thumb or forefinger to apply pressure directly to a tight area such as the shoulders or lower back.

- Use deep friction by pressing small circles with the thumb or fingertips deep enough to massage the muscles beneath the skin.

- To finish the massage on a relaxing note, try a technique called fingertip brushing by grazing the tips of your fingers along the surface of the skin. (CNS)

Giving blood may reduce heart attack risk

You've heard the spiel for healthy living: Eat lots of fresh fruit and vegetables. Keep your weight down. Get plenty of rest. Exercise. Donate blood.

Donate blood?

That's right. Even though many people are squeamish about giving, there may be health benefits associated with being a blood donor.

"Studies have shown that male blood donors have a lower risk of heart attacks than non-donors," said Jill Moline, spokeswoman for Heartland Blood Centers in Aurora, Ill.

"Research shows that donating blood reduces the level of iron stored in the body, making a person less likely to suffer a heart attack."

The studies also acknowledged that blood donors generally seem to be more health conscious and more healthy than those who don't donate blood.

While some people may have too little iron in their blood, the far greater problem in the United States may be having too much iron. Iron is common in the American diet. It's naturally abundant in meat and certain vegetables.

It's added to products such as baked goods and cereals to make them more nutritious. And vitamin and mineral formulas are fortified with iron.

Some studies suggest that both men and post-menopausal women may accumulate too much iron in their bodies, Moline noted. Donating blood frequently may keep excess iron from being stored in the body and help reduce the health risks associated with too much iron.

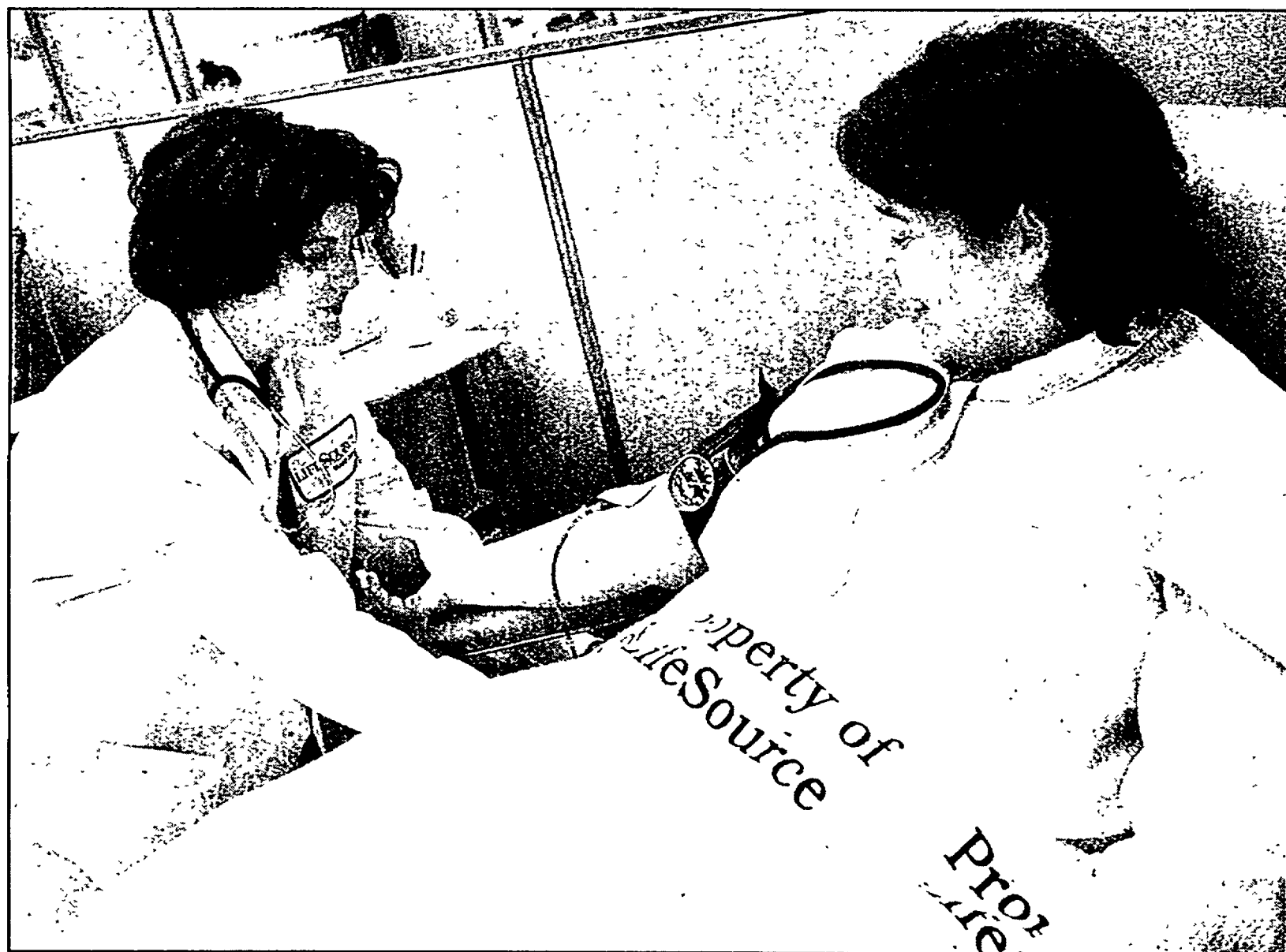
Some studies suggest that excess iron may contribute to plaque buildup in the arteries by damaging cells in artery walls. Over time, these plaque deposits can reduce or block blood flow to the heart.

"One donation of whole blood has been shown to reduce the amount of iron by approximately 250 milligram," said Amy Gardner-Nummer, spokeswoman for LifeSource Blood Services, a non-profit, full-service blood center in the Chicago area.

Men with early accumulation of iron are more at risk for early heart attacks. Women rarely experience heart attacks before age 45. At that point, they begin to see the same kind of steady rise in number of heart attacks seen in men, and they start accumulating iron just like men do, Gardner-Nummer said.

"Women naturally shed red blood cells," she pointed out. "Like plumbing with tacky buildup, the skins of red blood cells can collect in arteries, blocking blood flow and preventing nutrients and oxygen from getting into the system."

Statistics show that men over 45 are at a higher risk for heart disease and cancer. Combined, they kill more than 600,000 men a year.



Help others and yourself by donating blood. Research shows that giving blood reduces the level of iron stored in the body, which makes a person less likely to suffer a heart attack.

A person can donate whole blood every eight weeks, approximately six times each year. A single blood donation takes about 45 minutes. Eligible donors should weigh at least 110 pounds, be 17 years of age or older and have good health.

In a laboratory at the Fox Chase Cancer Center in Philadelphia, medical researchers took blood samples from more than 500 patients. They were looking for levels of stored iron the body can't use. Their analysis found that men even with moderate levels are almost twice as likely to develop colon polyps, tiny growths that usually turn into cancer.

How does iron contribute to cancer?

The most popular theory is that unlike many vitamins which are anti-oxidants, substances that fight cancer, iron is a pro-oxidant - it contributes to the damage in the cell that leads to cancer.

A University of Kansas study involving 4,000 people found men who gave blood three times a year reduced their chances of a heart attack by more than 50 percent. And preliminary evidence suggests getting rid of excess iron might lower a person's chances of developing colon, lung, bladder and esophagus cancer by as much as 40 percent.

An independent study in Finland supported the Kansas study.

"We always knew giving blood is a necessity," said Gardner-Nummer. "But these studies show that blood donors will not only do a good thing for others but also for themselves. We hope this evidence will lead to an interest and resurgence of blood donation."

Only 3 percent of the population participates in blood donation, Gardner-Nummer noted.

Dr. J. Bruce Miller, a hematologist at Hematology-Oncology Consultants in Naperville, Ill., said another advantage to giving blood is that because of health screens and lab tests, donors may be alerted to health problems they weren't aware they had.

"The screening can be like a doctor's office visit where patients are asked about their general health," Miller said.

The health screen involves a series of questions. The donors' hemoglobin is also measured to see if they have anemia. And their pulse, blood pressure and temperature are checked. Viral and liver tests are done on the blood to determine if the person is HIV positive or has hepatitis C.

"The donor gets a health screen that he wouldn't have gotten if he hadn't given blood," Miller said. "And the tests are free and confidential."

Miller emphasized that people giving and receiving blood have to be protected.

The purpose is to protect the blood supply and not give anyone diseases. He emphasized that a person cannot catch AIDS by donating blood.

"There are a lot of good reasons to be a blood donor," Miller said. "More people should do it."

DID YOU KNOW?

- Every 10 seconds, someone in the United States receives a blood transfusion.
- If you began donating blood at age 17 and donated every 56 days until you reached 76, you would have donated 48 gallons of blood.
- One out of every 10 people entering a hospital needs blood.
- Females receive 57 percent of blood transfusions; males receive 47 percent.
- A newborn has about 1 cup of blood in his or her body.
- An average adult has about 10 pints of blood in his or her body.
- About 95 percent of people living to the age of 72 will need a blood transfusion at some time in their life, yet only 3 percent of the population donates blood.
- Blood centers often run short of Types O and B blood. Shortages of all types of blood occur during the summer and winter holidays.
