Racetrack funding in jeopardy?

A feud on the west side of the state between two government entities could lead to thousands of dollars being sucked out of Northville. Sen. Leon Stille, R-Muskegon, has asked the state Attorney General and Auditor General to examine the process of how money is passed out to local municipalities from racetracks in their communities. Stille said the request follows a suit filed by Fruitport Township against the state of Michigan. When reviewing the state statute concerning the case, Stille said he discovered the seven communities in the

state that receive the funding may be spending funds incorrectly. In Northville, breakage money has been spent on things such as the improvement of Center Street and contributing to the improvement of Ford Field. "Honestly, I don't feel this money should be used in that way," Stille said. "Why should these seven communities have special funding just because they have horse tracks?" The cities receive money in the form of "breakage" from winnings paid out at the track. Here's how it works: each payout is rounded

down to the nearest tenth with the difference paid to the city in breakage. For example, if the payout is \$4.12, the winner gets \$4.10 and the city receives two cents. The money adds up. In 1999, \$605,997 was paid to the city of Northville, according to the Michigan Office of the Racing Commissioner. The seven communities of Hazel Park, Jackson, Isabella Township, Fruitport Township, Northville, Saginaw and Swartz Creek received \$1.98 million and spent \$534,000 on expenses. Of the money Northville received

last year, \$145,972 was taken out for expenses, leaving about \$460,000. The majority of the money will be used for improvements to Ford Field. Stille said using funds for things other than the direct expenses cities or townships incur due to track operation is against the state statute signed in 1995. The Horse Racing Act of 1995 reads, "all breaks shall be retained by the race meeting licensee and paid directly to the city or township in which the racetrack is located as a fee for services provided pursuant

to Section 21." Section 21 said the "local units of government participating in the distribution of funds shall provide for adequate police, fire and traffic protection of persons and property at and near each race meet." The act doesn't address the issue of where the excess money should be doled out. "I would be willing to look at increasing the list of things the money could be applied to," Stille said. Any monies, in addition to the

Divers down at Meads Mill

After-school program gives students a chance to explore

As the school year nears its end at Meads Mill so does the popular afterschool program for the year. On Tuesdays and Thursdays from 2:45 to 4 p.m., an average of 115 students attend the program funded by a Title I county grant. The grant is for programs targeting at-risk students but the school attempts to reach as many kids as possible, said principal Sue Meyer.

The program offers students a chance to catch up on homework, get extra help in school, and offers some fun alternatives to sitting in front of the TV, she said. Additionally there are times when students are bussed to local elementary schools or the high school for special events such as scuba diving. "I felt like I was weightless," said sixth grader Ross Boylan. "People aren't supposed to live in the water, but after that I felt like I was meant for it."

Recently students were treated to a scuba diving event at the high school. Instructors, tanks and equipment were brought in to help the students in their under water adventure. Sixth grader Patrick Maguire said he would definitely do it again. Although the equipment was a little intimidating at first, he said, in no time he got the hang of how to breath and turn in the water.

Township part of \$93 million plan to expand sewer plant

A special meeting will be held Friday among members of the Western Townships Utility Authority, which includes Northville Township, to consider entering a \$93 million sewer plant expansion deal. Northville Township likely would have to contribute about one-third of the cost, said Dick Henningsen, Northville Township supervisor. Chuck Barbieri, attorney for WTUA, said negotiating teams for WTUA and the Ypsilanti Community Utility Authority plant are in the process of going back to their boards for approval of a letter of intent. If approved, the member communities of Northville, Plymouth and Canton Townships would agree to pay \$93 million to expand the Ypsilanti plant. "The boards still have the

options of negotiating further, authorizing a signature to enter the agreement or simply say no," Barbieri said. The attorney said reports of an approved agreement earlier this week were incorrect. "A letter of intent hasn't been signed or sent yet," Barbieri said. A 1999 study conducted by WTUA highlighted the need for additional sewage capacity. The study indicates the three townships contributed 17 million gallons per day of sewage to the Detroit Water System and Ypsilanti plants in 1999. However, the study also indicates the expected amount of flow from the communities to near 30 million gallons per day by 2030. The combination of the Detroit Water System lease

WAYNE COUNTY MEDICAL EXAMINER INVESTIGATING DEATH

The Wayne County medical examiner is investigating the death of a 52-year-old Northville Township man.

The incident happened April 30 between 4 p.m. and midnight.

According to a Northville Township police report, the man's wife called police when she discovered her husband on the patio behind the house, not breathing. Police responded and reported the man was dead upon arrival.

A Northville Township police investigation revealed the man was 30 feet below a bathroom window which was open and had no screen. Further, one of the screen clips was on a vanity in the bathroom and one was found next to the man on the patio. Blue fibers were found to be

snagged on the bricks around the window. The wife told police the man had a history of schizophrenia and depression and he had been talking and acting "oddly" lately.

The body was removed by the Wayne County medical examiner.

LOADED GUN FOUND IN CAR THAT RUNS TOWNSHIP RED LIGHT

Northville Township found a loaded .380 Beretta pistol on a 36-year-old Detroit man who was stopped for running a red light.

The incident happened April 30 at 9:57 p.m.

According to a Northville Township police report, the man was stopped for running a red light at the intersection of Six Mile and Haggerty Road.

Police gave the man a citation and upon checking his background dis-

covered he was only supposed to be driving to and from work although he admitted he was leaving one girlfriend's house and driving to another girlfriend's house.

Police asked the man to step to the squad car to figure out if he could be driving and the man admitted to having the loaded weapon on his waistband. He did not have the proper permit to carry a concealed weapon.

He was arrested by police and released on a \$500 bond.

LIVONIA WOMAN ARRESTED FOR OPERATING UNDER INFLUENCE OF DRUGS

A 25-year-old Livonia woman was arrested for operating a vehicle under the influence of drugs.

The incident happened 3:30 p.m. April 30.

According to a city of Northville

police report, the woman was west-bound on Eight Mile near Lexington when she ran into a car waiting to turn left. She lost control of her car and ended up driving over the curb of the road.

A police investigation revealed the woman had just been given a shot of Demoral for a migraine headache at the hospital and took two Vicodin pills before getting behind the wheel to drive to her boyfriend's house. Several pill bottles were found on the passenger side floor.

She was taken to St. Mary's Hospital in Livonia. She was given a citation.

WOMAN ARRESTED FOR DRUNKEN DRIVING IN CITY OF NORTHVILLE

A 30-year-old Novi woman was arrested for drunken driving after she caused an accident at a strip mall at Novi Road and Allen Drive.

According to a city of Northville police report, the woman was attempting to pull into a strip mall at the location but missed the driveway and ran into a car exiting the lot.

TAYLOR MAN ARRESTED AFTER WEAVING WAY THROUGH DOWNTOWN

A 45-year-old Taylor man was arrested for drunken driving after weaving his way through downtown Northville.

The incident happened 3:38 a.m.,

April 29.

According to a city of Northville police report, the man was witnessed by police driving east on Main Street from Northville Road to Orchard weaving in and out of lanes.

He was stopped and told police he was lost and was trying to get to Ann Arbor Trail and Merriman Road from Wayne. A strong odor of intoxicants was detected on the man who was given a series of sobriety tests. He had difficulty with them including a preliminary breath test in which he blew a .176. In Michigan, .10 is considered too intoxicated to drive legally.

He was arrested. During his arrest and booking he told police several times that he intended to kill himself by hanging himself with a shirt or stuffing it down his throat. As a result, he was committed to St. Mary's Hospital in Livonia for psychiatric evaluation on a \$1,500 personal recognizance bond.

SCHOOLS TO SUPPORT PARKS AND REC PLAN

The school board approved a joint resolution to support Parks and Recreation Year 2000 Plan for Action, Parks and Recreation Commission as an advisory body representing the citizens of the Northville Community.

This resolution further states that the school board endorses the Parks and Rec plan but requests further review of some of their future programming.

The 2000 plan for action is a compilation of data collected from community surveys from 1997-99. It presents ideas and plans for future recreation in Northville.

The school board joins the Northville Township Board and Northville City Council in their support and promise to help improve recreation opportunities.

All three boards agreed to offer their full support to Parks and Rec in completing their charge.

State considers tuition program

Sending kids to college can be very expensive.

Even the state's vaunted Michigan Education Trust college savings program can carry a hefty price tag, requiring parents to plunk down a lump sum payment of \$5,000 for a "full benefits contract." Plus, the benefit has to be used at a Michigan college or university.

But Senate Majority Floor Leader Mike Rogers, R-Brighton, is proposing a new plan to put college within the reach of more state residents.

Senate Bills 599-600, sponsored by Rogers, would create a tax-free

savings plan that could be used for tuition and fees at any college or technical training institute across the country.

The plan would allow anyone — parents, grandparents, etc. — to start a savings plan for a youngster with as little as \$25 cash. The saver could add to the account through payroll deductions of as little as \$15 per pay.

The funds would be exempt from state taxes, and federal taxes would be deferred until the time of withdrawal.

"If you invest as little as \$10 a week during the first 18 years of a child's life at the conservative interest rate of 8 percent, you can have \$20,000 toward college or technical

training costs," Rogers said of the plan. "This is an investment in the future of Michigan families. Education is the foundation of our American Dream."

The account could be used for all costs related to college, including enrollment as well as room and board and books.

"When I introduced this idea last year, we heard from hundreds of people who were worried they would not be able to afford college costs for their children," he said. "I understand their concern and their anticipation of getting this program started."

The bills are awaiting action in the Senate and under review by its Finance Committee.

Correction

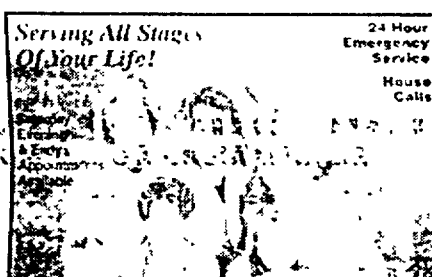

New township manager may be found in three months

After more than two years of going without a township manager, potential candidates for the open position in Northville Township will soon be named.

Bill Pomeroy, township board trustee and member of the manager search committee, said the next step in the search for a township manager will be to sift through the

applications received from advertisements.

Qualified candidates will be interviewed.

"The timeline proposed by the Mercer Group suggests that candidate identification, pre-screening of resumes, interviews and the selection process could be completed in the next three months depending, of course on the response we receive from qualified candidates," Pomeroy

said.

The Mercer Group is a professional search firm hired by the township to help with the process.

The manager should be in place sometime around early August if everything goes as planned, Pomeroy said.

Since the Lansing-based Mercer Group was contracted by the township about one month ago, the group has interviews township board mem-

bers, directors and department managers to obtain additional input on the search process.

Additionally, a timeline was put together, but it is optimistic, Pomeroy said. And he said sticking to it wasn't first priority.

"The board will be more concerned with employing the best candidate than adhering to a preliminary schedule, although we intend to give this task a high priority,"

Pomeroy said.

The township is going through the process now after a two-year study conducted by a committee appointed by the township board two years ago. The committee was appointed after the township went through five managers in 10 years between 1987 to 1997, to determine why turnover was so frequent.

The study group determined a large part of the problem was hav-

ing a manager in place without enough authority to properly carry out his or her job. As a result, the township is working on putting an ordinance in place that would delegate the authority to the township manager.

"I imaging it'll be fun to drive by 50 years from now, see it and know I had a part in it," Burrell said.

Burrell's sign, which will be built by Hillside shop students, will be a six-foot natural wood finish sign

with the school's name on it. The top of the sign reflects the rolling hill the school sits on.

"I really wanted something that reflected the area and the name of the school, and the natural wood finish is sort of rustic like Northville. It really reflects the past," Burrell said.

Burrell said he got some good-natured teasing from colleagues and students for winning since he

is the art teacher. But in his defense, he said he tried to give the idea away to some of his students but they weren't interested.

On the other hand, Amy Rauner, who is now a freshman at Northville High school, said her raider has already been a staple decoration at Cooke. The stalwart raider atop an angry black stallion was a mural she designed in one of her art classes in her last year at

Cooke. It was chosen last year for a mural at the school and school officials decided this year it was the look of victory and determination which should line their gym floor.

The design of the school's mascot took 40 minutes of Rauner's class time for a duration of eight weeks. Rauner said it wasn't a difficult assignment for her as mascots are her specialty.

"I really like drawing mascots,"

she said. "It's fun and I guess I'm good at it. There's something quiet and calming about drawing little cartoons bounding around."

Rauner has also designed her Ann Arbor Hockey team's mascot, the bobcat. She also said she is interested in pursuing her quirky talent as a career. Rauner said eventually she'd like to do some animation or graphic design for Disney.

For now, she is content making her mark right here in Northville.

"This is just great," she said. "It's such a great feeling to have my work put in such a prominent place and to have it recognized by such a prominent organization."

Lane has been a one woman welcoming Committee for all those new to Northville for 13 years. She said though it is a business, welcoming new people into town and promoting all Northville has to offer is really her reward.

Lane spreads her community cheer throughout Northville City and Township. Lane, who wouldn't disclose exactly how she receives the name of new families, said she works in conjunction with City, Township and Real Estate officials. She also said, sometimes it's by simple word of mouth she hears of these newcomers.

Once she gets the name of a new family in town, Lane or her associate, will go to the home with a packet of invitational discounts and information about Northville for the homeowner. Lane said she primarily gets special offers from businesses in the downtown or Guernsey Dairy area.

"We try to have a little bit of everything in the packet from food offers to service offers," she said.

Lane said they even make up brochures for new apartment dwellers in the area.

For homeowners, Lane will sit down and explain each card in the packet and answer any questions new Northvillians might have.

"Usually people want to know where a good place to eat is because their houses are usually in an uproar and they can't cook,"

she said.

In addition to promoting the downtown merchants and Northville, Lane said she hopes her business helps build the sense of community for which Northville is known.

"For some people this (Calling Cart) is their first contact with Northville," she said. "I just want them to know how wonderful the community they are moving into is."

Parents work toward a better playground

Silver Springs Elementary Parents mixed work and play April 29 as they helped to build a new playscape on the school's playground.

The Silver Springs Parent Teacher Association (PTA) and over 50 other parent volunteers helped to build a new playscape for the school. Additionally, they raised over \$8,000 to cover the cost of the equipment.

"It helps gives families more of a feeling of ownership and it may make people want to keep it nice knowing how much work they put into it," said PTA Treasurer Sue Pinto.

Silver Springs PTA Vice President Gail Krechelt said the parents worked very well together and even brought some construction experience to the team.

"We had some parents who had a construction background so that helped tremendously," she said.

However, the construction manager from Landscape Structures, who supervised the group, was clearly in charge she said. He grouped parents together and

handed out job assignments.

The parents helped to construct the painted aluminum playscape which includes, multilevel platforms, slides, slide bars, monkey bars as well as a free standing tire swing, she said.

Krechelt said the PTA is hoping to add a swing set at a later date as part of phase two of the improvement project.

Krechelt said the PTA got involved when they realized the need for the new playscape. "There was definitely a need for this improvement as the equipment was getting old and may not have been up to today's safety standards," Krechelt said.

Originally, the district allocated \$26,500 from the 1997 bond issue to improve the playground at the school. But Krechelt said the PTA decided to help raise more money to fund the project in order to purchase the best playscape for the children.

They began holding fundraisers and raised an extra \$8,808 for the project. Krechelt said through market days and pizza luncheons the PTA pulled together for one common goal.

"This really is for the kids and we wanted to be able to help our kids have better equipment while they were still there, as well as, help future classes," she said.

Pinto said not only did the parents get a sense of involvement from the project but also it reduced the cost by \$11,000.

Pinto said the subcommittee with the Silver Springs design team began researching different play structures to find the one best suited to the Silver Springs children's needs.

They whittled the choices down to three companies who submitted bids ranging from Engan-Tooley and Associates's bid of \$28,793 to Landscape Structures Inc at \$35,308.

The decision to go with the highest bidder was made by the committee and approved by the school board on March 14. According to Assistant Superintendent Dave Bolitho, the bid best met the design established by the subcommittee, provided the best support services of all three bidders, had a track record of one day installations, and provided a play structure which encompassed the maxi-

mum play value of the three bidders.

"Safety came first with us," Krechelt said. "We wanted something with the most playability and was somewhat spread out so different groups of children could play. We were also looking for something that had a lot of different activities and one that would appeal to kids at different grade levels."

For Pinto, the selling point was the one day installations.

"Since we wanted to do this over Spring Break, we thought we'd get the most volunteers if we did it in one day rather than over 3 or 4," she said.

Further, she said she particularly liked that they encouraged parent involvement in the project.

Pinto said only about half of the money raised by the PTA went to this portion of the playground and will be put back into the fund for phase two of the playground improvement.

Sky's the limit with Destination Imagination

Northville students blasted off for Destination Imagination at a recent state competition.

The Fruit Roller Coaster team from Amerman Elementary placed eighth out of 22 in the state. However they, as well as other local teams, used their imaginations and ingenuity to construct creative solutions to story problems. The students had to hand make and develop obstacle courses complete with stories, characters and histories in order for the project to be complete. Each team had an adult coach, but the catch was the coach couldn't give any help. They were only allowed to facilitate during the four month planning process, said Coach Barbara Soyster.

"It's hard to keep your mouth shut and not tell them how to solve the problem," Soyster said. "Although, it was better in the long run because they came up with some ideas I never would have thought of."

But this was the object of the competition. Soyster said, for the children to be creative and explore all options of a problem.

For Soyster and co-coach Sue Spillane's team, the students had to design a roller coaster for tennis balls. They would be judged on how fast they could get the tennis balls to loop around the track. Further, the teams had to build in prescribed "thrill events" such as loops and jumps as well as designing their own.

This project, Soyster said, offered students who may not be grabbed

by traditional means of teaching the physics involved in this project to become involved creatively in a project teaching these principles. Every student at each level of the competition received the same problem. But, Soyster said, she was amazed at how each team came up with something entirely different to answer the question.

"I just loved it. I was so impressed with how these kids think through these problems and have outcomes that are so different from one another. It's just amazing to see," she said.

Parent John Cauffiel's "Eggsploration" team, which included his daughter, 8-year-old Ursula, is a prime "egg-sample."

For their challenge, they had to get five eggs through an obstacle course they designed without breaking any of the eggs of course. The eggs had to be transported over a wall, across a gap, and be passed through or conveyed by a moving device. They also had to create two additional obstacles which were evaluated for creativity/originality, and degree of difficulty.

"We only had 10 minutes to put everything together and do our presentation," John Cauffiel said. "It was a little nerve racking."

Cauffiel's team created a medieval theme for their project. Ursula Cauffiel said they decided on the theme because of the wall and ran with the idea from there.

"We said the eggs were knights and we had names for all of them and a story for each," she said.

They built their obstacle course mainly from materials donated by Home Depot, John Cauffiel said. "Lot of PVC pipe," Cauffiel said with a chuckle.

Further, the teammates dressed their parts including one girl who glued cotton balls to her shirt and then rigged a hair dryer inside her costume to make it look like a blowing cloud. Ursula Cauffiel said.

The team was successful in moving each of the five eggs one at a time through the course with no egg casualties and ended up placing third in the regional competition, the Cauffiels said.

200 parents for and against the class came out to voice their opinions at a March subcommittee meeting. Since then, many of the instructional kits and videos were removed from the course. In light of the controversy, Superintendent Leonard Rezmerski gave the Health Advisory Committee a year to revise the class. The School Board, however, will decide whether it will be required or elective. If it is required, the board can build in an opt-out for the sex ed portion, required except for a parent permission opt-out for the entire course, or required with two tracks the parent or parents can choose for their student. Either sex education-abstinence based or abstinence centered. Abstinence centered does not teach various birth control methods.

Bennett said the parents who have signed her petition are urging the board to abandon the course as a requirement altogether.

However, there are some people in the area who believe the Board shouldn't bow to such parental pressure.

"I think they should take what the parents say under advisement," said Northville resident John Buckland. "But once they

have everyone's input, they should make the best decision. I think they (the school board) needs to show some guts," he said.

Buckland, whose children graduated from Northville schools, said parents have a right to be concerned for their children's education but they also have a right to put them in private schools.

Bennett said, she and the parents she represents, want to work with the district to change the curriculum.

The petition idea began after a group of parents were meeting at another parent's house early in March, Bennett said. They were soon discussing the health curriculum. Some had seen the contents and some had not, Bennett said. At this point, Bennett said the "kits" were still part of the curriculum. The kits were instructional materials which were to be used in the class. One of the kits

demonstrated the proper way to put on a condom on the model of an erect penis. The other was a bag of flash cards depicting abstract objects standing for parts of the anatomy. Both have since been removed but Bennett said her initial reaction to the class was strong because of them.

"I felt they went way too far and were in poor taste," she said.

Bennett said she and other parents felt they needed to "get the word out" to other parents about the contents of this course.

She said she drew up two petitions one to have the kits removed and one to make the class an elective.

"The good thing about a petition is a lot of people won't take the time to write a letter to voice their opinions but they will sign their names to a petition," she said.

At last count Bennett and others who volunteered to take up a petition, turned in over 470 names to the school board.

"For such an informal network of parents to get that response is pretty amazing," Bennett said.

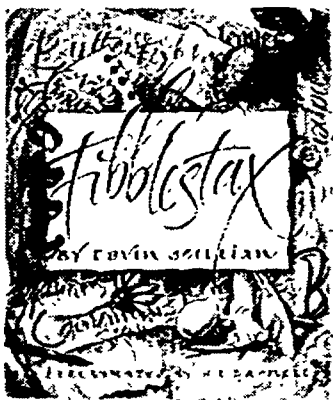

Township buries time capsule

No one knows what Northville Township will be like in 100 years, but officials hope people in 2100 will know what today is like.

As a result, township officials "buried" a time capsule in a cornerstone of Northville Township Hall last week that contained a number of items telling what one official said is likely to be "the most transitional period Northville Township will ever see."

"We are going through a huge change right now," said Maureen Osiecki, the director of planning for Northville Township. "We'll probably never go through another transition like we are right now."

The idea for the capsule was developed by Karen Woodside, former Northville Township

supervisor who resigned in February. The idea was spawned partly by the renovations of the restrooms in the township hall.

"We were redoing the restrooms to be in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act so we were going to have a big hole anyway," Osiecki said.

The items, which were mostly paper, were put into a fireproof file and tucked behind a plaque commemorating the township's 100-year existence from 1898 to 1998.

Items in the capsule include, among other things, a photo of the 1996-2000 board of trustees; an employee list from 2000; several awards the township has received; a compilation of township land acquired in recent years; a copy of the Northville Record from 1898; and various photographs.

"We've done a lot of projects in the

last couple of years and I think we should be proud of it," she said.

Osiecki said because of legal reasons, the land and building where Northville Township Hall stands likely will never be sold.

Marv Gans, Northville Township board of trustee, said the capsule is a good part of history.

"You never know," he said. "Some people down the road may wonder what we were doing today, this provides a good synopsis of it."

Gans said it isn't uncommon for municipalities to have a time capsule in a cornerstone of its building.

"It provides a good capsule of the major things that have occurred that otherwise may be lost," he said.

Police catch check forging duo

Northville Township Police are looking for a Detroit couple who allegedly duped about \$1,800 out of a Standard Federal bank.

Detective Michael Wildt of Northville Township Police, said warrants have been obtained from the Wayne County Prosecutor for the arrest of a 19-year-old male from Detroit and 23-year-old female from Detroit. Names are being withheld pending arraignment.

The two allegedly obtained a payroll account number of a Troy-based business and created fake checks with the information, Wildt said.

Surveillance cameras in the bank show the two cashing the checks, one for \$879 and the other for \$975, at Standard Federal, 39437 W. Six Mile Road on Feb. 25.

The thieves didn't make it hard for officials to identify them, Wildt said.

"They provided their identification to the tellers and also were clearly seen in the videotape," Wildt said.

The duo was charged with one count of uttering and publishing fraudulent material each.

The male faces up to 14 years in prison if convicted. The female, who is on probation from another fraud, faces up to 21 years and is being

charged as a habitual offender.

Wildt said police don't know how the two obtained the payroll account information about the Troy business.

However, he said, the case is an unfortunate reminder of how important it is to monitor all billing statements.

"Whenever you get any kind of statement, it probably wouldn't be a bad idea to go through it and verify all purchases and charges were made by you," he said.

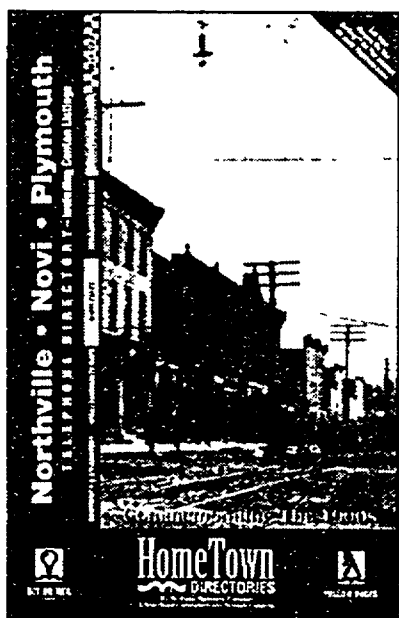

Student makes the grade in Singapore

With a little of this and a little of that, 20-year-old Evan Demers whipped up a dish that made Singapore sing.

The Schoolcraft College student and Northville native was part of a team competing in a culinary competition in Singapore (Date). Schoolcraft's team was one of 28 competing world wide and the only team from the United States. Demers earned a bronze medal for his squid dish helping his team to an overall best team medal. But those results were of a week's worth of work, rigorous competition and a lot of test meals.

"All the recipes have to be original and everything has to be from scratch, your vegetables can't be cut, your meat has to be whole, and you have to prepare four of the same dish in an hour," Demers said.

The Schoolcraft team began brainstorming their projects several weeks before the competition, he said. The teams under the supervision of five master chefs brain stormed, researched, and practiced multiple incarnations of their final dishes.

"Originally I started with a

tuna dish," he said. "Over time, it totally evolved into something else."

Demers said he and members of his team would do flavor profiling to get just the right combination of tastes in what they were preparing.

"You try to match tastes that naturally go together like tomato and basil," he said. "Well, I knew that squid had a natural affinity for saffron so I put the squid in a saffron broth."

This food analysis continues, he said, until a chef has a perfect combination of flavors. For Demers, it was a mint basil pesto brushed lightly onto squid stuffed with shrimp, scallops, bread and cayenne. All of this was poached and served in a saffron broth with watercress, which was a last minute addition.

"Originally, I was using a spinach garnish but they (Singapore Market) had such a beautiful bunch of watercress, I decided to go with that instead on the day of the competition," he said.

When the students arrived in Singapore, Demers said, they were in a bit of a rush to get settled and quickly buy their ingredients from the local mar-

kets. "They had a live market there," he said. "Live squid, frogs, eel, chickens. All your proteins are alive. If you love food, you want to see this."

Once the group had gathered their necessary ingredients, they went to the competition space. Then they were stuck into tiny glassed-in kitchens with the cutting edge of culinary technology, including heat induction stoves, all around them. The five judges, all from Europe and Asia, sat and watched the chefs as they prepared each meal from stands just beyond the glass, Demers said.

This put an added pressure on the chefs, who only had an hour to perfectly prepare four of the same dish. Additionally, the judges did not just judge the food, Demers said. They looked at the sanitary conditions of the kitchen including whether instruments and counters were wiped down. Further, they looked to see if the chef had cooked the dish properly.

"For example if you were poaching something, they'd make sure you were doing it at the right temperature and for the right amount of time," he

said. "Additionally, they judge things such as knife cuts and how healthy the meal is, and of course how it tastes."

Demers took home a bronze in the individual apprentice competition as well as the honor of being a part of the team to win best apprentice team of the entire competition.

However, Demers is not content to rest on his success. He plans to continue in Schoolcraft's culinary program but eventually would like to transfer to a program in Europe.

"It's great because all you do is cook. You don't know anyone and you don't have friends or anything like that holding you back," he said.

Demers said he hopes to count himself among the master chefs in the country of which there are only 38.

But right now he said, he is content going to school, being a chef at Little Italy, and traveling.

"I'm in my prime," he said. "I still have some time to change around."

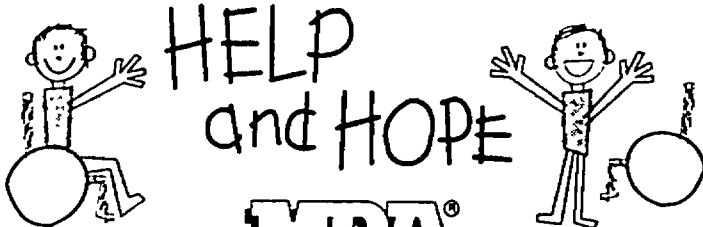

items on the list, would go back to the office of the racing commissioner. Communities would be eligible to apply for grants to help offset the cost of projects, whereby the tracks would benefit such as new sewer lines.

Money not used in that regard would then go back into the purse pool, or winnings paid out, to help increase attendance at racetracks, Stille said.

Gary Word, Northville city manager, said losing the racetrack funds wouldn't break the city, but it wouldn't help either.

"Any money we get is important," Word said. "We don't budget for it under city council rules, but the money is used for special projects."

Stille said the Office of the Racing

Commissioner should be in charge of monitoring breakage.

Jim Bowes, state deputy racing commissioner, said the office hasn't developed an opinion on whether or not they would like to handle the job.

"This is not our bill and the Office of the Racing Commissioner is not out in front in this matter," Bowes said.

Additionally, he said the issue would have to be studied more closely by the office.

"We haven't been apprised of the kinds of additional dollars it would cost to administer the program," Bowes said.

A history of the track quandary

What started as one community's attempt to eliminate crime from its horse racing track has turned into much more and threatens to take a bundle of money from Northville.

But what is going on between Fruitport Township, located just a few miles from Muskegon, and the state of Michigan that could affect Northville so negatively?

Ron Cooper, Fruitport Township supervisor, said it started when the local board of trustees tried to put a pair of its own eyes and ears at the Great Lakes Downs, a track in the community.

"We felt we could appoint a township official with the responsibility to be our eyes and ears at the racetrack," Cooper said. "We wanted to keep crime down because there was a time when it was such a mess and embarrassment. If it was going to be like that, we didn't want to have it open."

Business and crime were so bad at the

simulcast racing track it shut down for one year in 1998. It reopened in 1999 with live thoroughbred racing and to ensure the problems of the past stayed in the past, the township wanted to create its own "racing official," said Jim Bowes, deputy state racing commissioner.

The position's job responsibilities mirrored that of the Office of the Racing Commissioner," Bowes said. "We believed they didn't need to have that position."

As a result, Fruitport Township board of trustees decided to sue the state of Michigan for the right to have the official in place.

Major problems arose, however, when the township started to pay for attorney fees in the case with breakage money. Cooper said the township spent about \$30,000 of the \$122,000 it took in on breakage on court costs associated with the case.

"We would like to improve roads and

put bike paths in place and spend the money on things that actually have some connection with the track," Cooper said. "But we had to use so much fighting for the right to put our own official out there."

Sen. Leon Stille, R-Muskegon, said he became involved when he was reviewing the case and discovered the breakage money technically is only supposed to be spent on police, fire and safety costs — not attorney fees to sue the state.

As a result, he asked the state Attorney General and Auditor General to determine if money in excess of direct cost to communities may revert to their general funds, as is the case in Northville.

If not, Stille said he's willing to consider a change in statute.

"I would consider increasing the list of things this money could be applied to," he said.

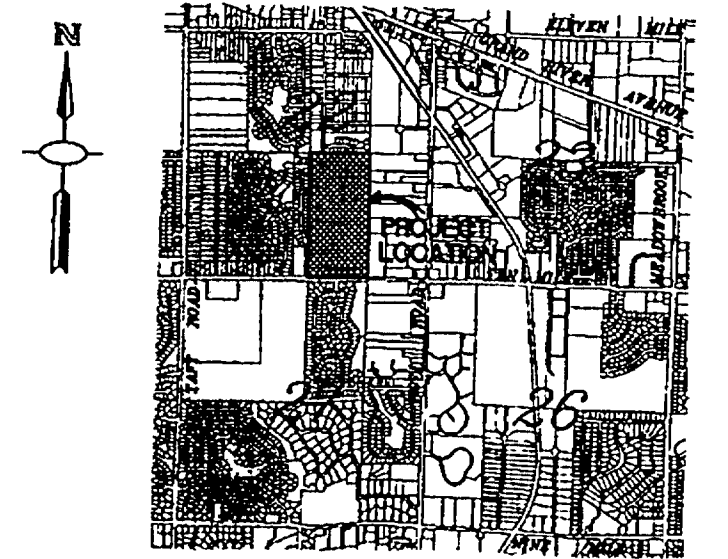

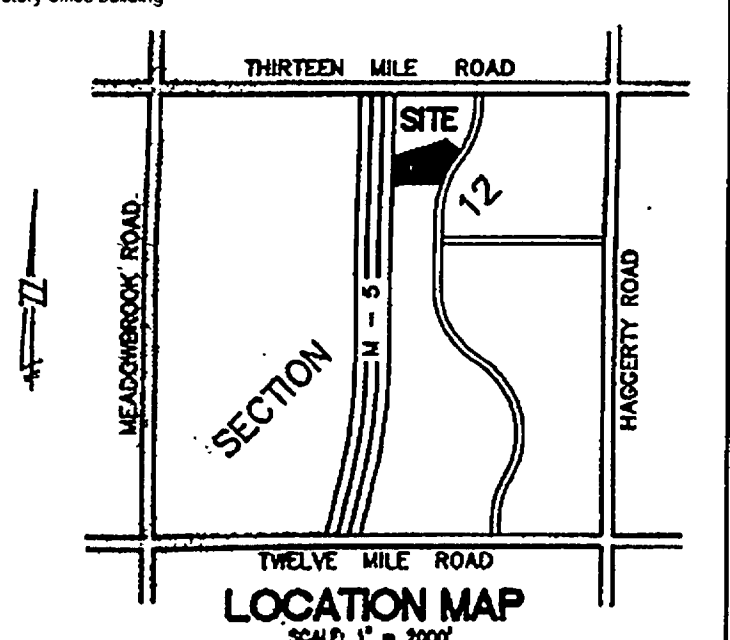

Boylan agreed and said it was an something he had never experienced before.

"It was like going into space it was that new," he said. "I felt like a fish. I could swim backwards and to the surface to see people. I was like a sea creature."

Though this was a special event, even the everyday activities are something the students look forward to, said eighth grader Pat Daneau. He participated in the after-school study group held in the library. Several teachers volunteer to stay afterschool and help students with homework or to better understand concepts in a class.

Daneau said he likes the program because it's not only educational but social.

"I use the time to work ahead in my classes. And it's nice because you have your friends here and we kind of help each

other. Plus, you can't usually talk with friends in class but here you can talk and no one will say anything," he said.

For eighth grader Kim Larson, she said the time spent with teachers after school is beneficial. She said she would rather take the extra time at school instead of going home and realizing she doesn't understand something. Fellow eighth grader Karen Tonch agreed and said she has seen a definite improvement in her grades since she started going through the program.

Additionally, Meads has drawn members of the community to the program such as Officer Matt Mayes from the Northville Township Police for the DARE program to teach students about the dangers of drugs and alcohol. Next year he will also be running the GREAT program which will teach students about self esteem and peer pressure.

Also on the roster of volun-

teers is community member Lisa Hartman who lends her master gardening skills to a backyard garden at the school. Lenz said she teaches students how to till the soil and which plants, vegetables and herbs will grow when.

"They built the fence around the garden and did all the shoveling and raking," she said. "It's a lot of hard work."

opinions and views are two of the more important things Selinsky said he has gained from his experience on the township zoning board of appeals and board of trustees.

"We can all work together to do something good for the community," he said.

Professionally, Selinsky has held a number of positions in the legal field including the last 16 years as an attorney. Before becoming an attorney at Farmington Hills-based Dickow and Brady, Selinsky worked for 14 years as a police officer and command officer with the Wayne County Sheriff's Department. His duties included drug enforcement and patrol of the western Wayne County townships and county parks.

Selinsky's community involvement includes president and board member of the Whisperwood Homeowners Association and involvement in Boy Scout Troop

755 in Northville. He has been married to his wife, Kathleen, for 28 years and they have four children.

Lowe said being challenged as an incumbent seeking reelection will be one in a long line of firsts for him.

"I've also been the first judge under 40, first to work with Judge (John) McDonald to put domestic violence and juvenile delinquency educational programs in place through the court, the first to host Law Day with more than 300 students, the first to help with the paperwork to build up a courthouse that burned down and the first to hold a settlement case in an unfinished bathroom," Lowe said.

"Everybody has to do what their own goals and desires are and I wish him well," said Marv Gans, Northville Township board of trustee.

"I'm disappointed," said Sue Hillebrand, Northville Township clerk. "But at the same time, I think he would make an excellent judge because he is fair and sensitive to people."

"As soon as we have an agreement in place I'm sure there will be more planning to be done on the part of the local boards," he said.

Additionally, Henningsen said the project would likely be paid through bonds.

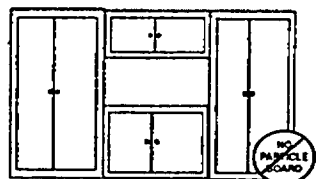

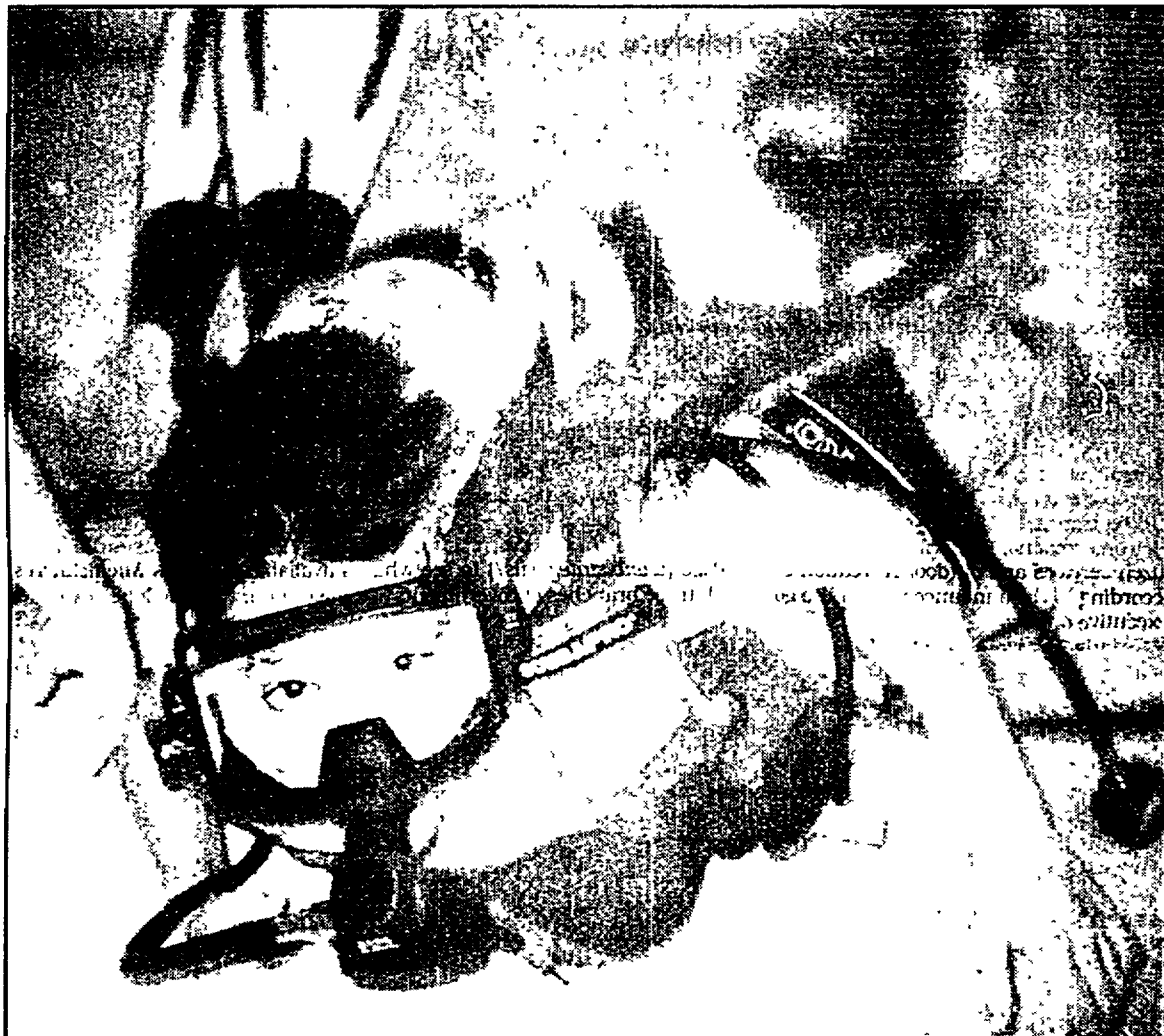

Education is best investment for state

I admit it. I'm a sucker for ceremonies like weddings and graduations. I suppose it's mostly because the ritual makes concrete and intensifies the emotion of the event.

I like university commencements best of all. I never fail to be moved at the sight of a young person — often the first in the entire history of the family — receiving a college degree and thereby entering "the community of educated men and women." The grin of the newly minted graduate turns incandescent and nobody minds when the family's whoops of joy punctuate the decorum of the ceremony.

There were a lot of grins throughout Michigan last weekend. Something like 45,000 graduates and their families piled into Michigan Stadium for the University of Michigan's ceremonies, while President Clinton spoke on Sunday to a packed house at Eastern Michigan's commencement exercises in Ypsilanti.

So when I was invited to say a few words at the commencement of the College of Natural Resources and the Environment at U-M, I was happy to put on my academic robe and proceed down the aisle to the tune of Jeremiah Clarke's fine air for trumpet.

Sitting on the stage and listening to the awards being handed out and the speeches being given, I found myself reflecting on what is really going on at the core of this gigantic enterprise that takes adolescent high school graduates and over four years or so turns them into educated men and women.

I had no idea what would become of the kids sitting before me, only partly solemn in their black robes, some with flowers stuck to their academic hats. Some would become landscape architects, while others would challenge the cap-

tains of industry as leaders of the environmental movement. Some might not even have a career in natural resources; they might go off to law school or become teachers.

But each would have received while at the university an enormous injection of what might be called "human capital." And the value added to each graduate — value for society, value for the graduate — by the university experience is perfectly enormous.

The dry data in the Digest of Education Statistics sum up the value added in cold, hard cash.

In 1997 (the last year for which statistics are available), men with less than a 9th grade education earn on the average \$19,291 per year. Average annual earnings for male high school graduates rise to \$31,215. But the average BA graduate earned \$48,616.

The earnings gains are even more remarkable as the years of investment in human capital increase. At the master's level, average earnings jump to \$61,051, while those who go on to a professional degree earn an average of \$85,011.

I'm not certain measuring human worth in dollars and cents is the best way of doing it, but the facts possess a certain solidity. Investing in human capital through college education pays off better than any other investment I can think of.

Those in Lansing who preside over the allocation of taxpayer dollars might bear this fact in mind, especially when they consider the trade off between appropriating money to educate young people at Michigan universities and warehousing criminals in prisons.

In my experience, universities don't make this point very well when they lobby the legislature at appropriations time. A. Bartlett Giamatti, the former president of Yale, understood the issue when he wrote in his book, *A Free and Ordered Place*: "Of all the threats to the institution, the most dangerous come from within. Not the least among them is the smugness that believes the institution's value is so self-evident that it no longer needs explanation, its mission so manifest that it no longer requires definition and articulation."

It's no loss of dignity for university presidents to point out that their institutions add more value than any other. And it's hardly crass to point out that a dollar spent in developing young minds pays off better than any other investment that the state can conceivably make.

Web will change how Michigan works

Even in this day and age, not every elected official gets it — that government, at least in this country, is supposed to serve the people. Not all understand that government information should be readily available to the public, that government services should be easy for citizens to use.

So it is nice to be able to say that, clearly, Michigan's governor John Engler does get it.

The evidence is in his executive order, issued last month, creating a new e-Michigan Office and establishing an advisory council to oversee it.

Considering the popularity of things "e" these days, this development might easily be overlooked. But that would be a mistake.

The state government already has a vast array of information available to citizens on the Internet, from every bill introduced into the Legislature in recent sessions to campaign finance reports to consumer alerts put out by the state Attorney General's office.

So the purpose of the new e-Michigan office is more than just putting things out there on the Web. The office's task is to go a step further.

"E-Michigan will work with state agencies in reengineering their business processes to allow services to be transacted through the Internet or other electronic means, including business services, citizen services and outdoor recreation services," according to the announcement of the governor's executive order.

In other words, the state will change the way it does business to make better use of this new technology known as the Internet and as a result, make it easier for citizens to use state services.

What a radical concept! Change the way you work to make full use of a new tool. If you are like me, you can probably name half a dozen private sector companies that could benefit from similar thinking.

Engler named Stephanie Comal, previously the

director of State Government Affairs, as the director of the new e-Michigan office. He gave the five member advisory council two years to do its work.

Before you go and dismiss this in so much as techno-hyperbole and likely-to-be-unrealized promises for a bright, shiny Internet future, consider how much the state already has out there posted in cyberspace. Michigan is well-ahead of most other governmental units and appears to be a leader among state governments as well, in its use of the Internet.

Take a trip to the Michigan Government Home Page (www.state.mi.us/) to see what is available. All three branches of government; administration, the legislature and the courts, are represented there. Listings for 21 administrative departments are already listed. New offices within those departments are being added all the time.

The state offers a telephone directory (www.state.mi.us/dmb/ocaf/directory/) that allows citizens to look up, by name, every employee of the state.

You can pull up tax forms (www.treas.state.mi.us/forms/pub/formind.htm) or file taxes electronically

(www.treas.state.mi.us/miltax/indtax/efile.htm).

You can look up any bill introduced in the legislature, the analyses that explain them, or read the House and Senate Journals - (www.michigan-legislature.org/). You can peruse the state's primary reference book, the Michigan Manual - (documents.michiganlegislature.org/manual/). You can take a quick trip to the Library of Michigan, the official depository of state government documents - (www.libofmich.lib.mi.us/).

On the state Attorney General's page (www.ag.state.mi.us/), you can read the latest consumer alerts issued or you can file a consumer complaint of your own. You can access state audit reports

(www.state.mi.us/audgen/index.htm) and you can dig up campaign finance reports filed by candidates running for state office and the Political Action Committees that lobby them - (www.sos.state.mi.us/).

There is even something there for kids. The Department of Agriculture has a site that lets youngsters visit and learn about county fairs and dairy farms

(www.mda.state.mi.us/kids/index.htm). Last, but not least, there are lists of e-mail addresses for lawmakers posted there, which allows Michigan residents to send a quick electronic letter expressing their views on the issue of the day or proposals pending before the legislature - (www.house.state.mi.us/locate.html) and (www.state.mi.us/senate/index.htm).

This is the starting point from which the governor is ordering up a two-year program of improvement.

**Safer cigarettes
are a just a fallacy**

To the editor:
Despite all of the unsubstantiated claims of lower smoking risk, RJR's supposedly "safer" Eclipse cigarette does only one thing for sure — eclipse the truth about the harmful effects of tobacco.

Touted as "the next best thing" to quitting, this newest concoction does nothing to protect smokers from cardiovascular disease and stroke by RJR's own admission. Each year, more than 400,000 people die from smoking, and the largest portion of these deaths were cardiovascular-related. Only the tobacco industry, it seems, would boast about lower risks of a product that has the potential to kill hundreds of thousands of people. Indeed, RJR admits that the new Eclipse cigarette generates higher carbon monoxide levels than regular cigarettes, making it even more dangerous for smokers from a cardiovascular standpoint.

As for RJR's claim that switching to Eclipse cigarettes will mean a lower risk for cancer and related lung diseases, we are not buying it. Indeed, we have no way of verifying these claims, no process of independent scientific validation or medical review of the science involved. What we do have is years of tobacco industry deception and misrepresentation.

The tobacco industry needs to be regulated by the Food and Drug Administration, so unsubstantiated claims, like those made by RJR for its Eclipse cigarettes, would be subjected to rigid, independent scientific scrutiny.

Perhaps the most damaging aspect of this so-called "safer" cigarette is the false sense of security it gives smokers about their

life-threatening habit.

Smoking one of RJR's new Eclipse cigarettes is like playing a "safer" game of Russian roulette, with one difference: with the Eclipse cigarette, all the chambers are loaded with bullets.

Tennis anyone?

Morning club jumpstarts their hearts with tennis

Tennis enthusiast Chuck Glinz doesn't play around.

When he noticed that the Sport's Club of Novi didn't have a morning tennis league, he took it upon himself to create one.

"In the morning, from 7 - 9 a.m., this place was empty," said Glinz. "They had all these beautiful courts and no one was using them."

The 67-year-old said he just wanted to get something organized for early birds like himself, who enjoy playing the game.

"I just thought there should be some kind of league for retirees and for people who work the afternoon shift or have something else going on during the day," said Glinz, who has been a tennis player for over 30 years.

It took a lot of convincing, but, the tennis crusader finally got his wish.

"I approached the tennis department in October, November, and December," he said. "And finally in late February, they gave their approval."

Whether it's singles or doubles, everyone will get a chance to play, because one of the best parts of the early tennis league, Glinz said, is that there is always a guaranteed number of equal players.

"You don't have to concern yourself with getting people to play," he said. "I promise that there will always be an even number of participants. If seven people come out, I make the eighth. If six players show up, then I sit out. So no matter who comes, they're guaranteed a spot on the court."

Glinz, who holds the title as the Michigan Men's Senior Singles Champion, said he encourages players, both men and women at all levels to come out.

"We pair everyone up so that both sides are equally competitive. Its not like we're going to put strong players against weaker ones," he said. "You don't have to worry about a thing, all you have to do is show up."

Novi resident Jim Robinson, who has been playing tennis for 30 years, says he is thrilled with the morning addition.

"It's a great way to get the day started," he said. "Its very inexpensive to play and I appreciate the fact that Chuck is here to make sure we always have an even number of players."

For Sports Club members, the cost is just \$5 for two hours of play and non-members may purchase guest passes for an additional \$10.

Glinz said the club is a great place to play and that the staff is an even greater group of people.

"They've been just terrific," he said. "You couldn't ask for a nicer

group of people. They've been very supportive."

Even though it was a short season, running from March to April, the league will be back again in September.

"The season was short because it took some time to organize. Come late April, the weather gets nice and people want to be outside," said Glinz.

"But next season, the program will run roughly eight months, from September to April or May, whenever it warms up again."

Connie Loftus, assistant tennis manager at the club, said she was impressed by Glinz's dedication for getting the early league up and running.

"Chuck is a big advocate when it comes to promoting tennis,"

she said. "He has a lot of experience with this. He knows a lot of people and he saw that there was a high demand for this sort of thing."

Loftus said she thought the morning tennis program was a great idea and said they are looking forward to doing it again next year.

Tennis veterans George Willis from Novi, who has been playing the game for 45 years, and Tom Klinefelter from Suttons Bay, who has been playing for over 50 years, said they are delighted for the opportunity to use the courts and are very glad Glinz started the program.

Bill Hammer, a 22 year old tennis player from Farmington Hills, agreed.

"I think it's great," he said. "It's a lot of fun and really good competition."

Glinz said he'd like to see as many participants as possible come September.

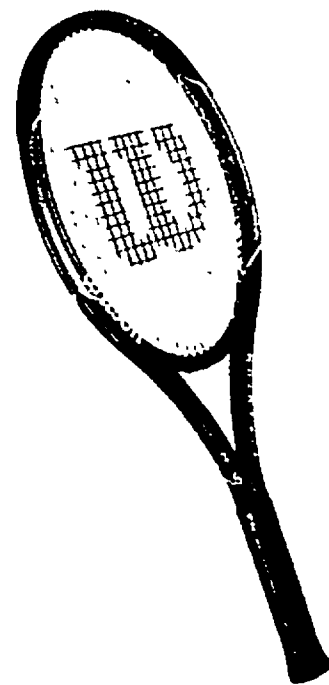
"Its great exercise and a whole lot of fun. And for just \$5, its practically free," he said.

"There's also an awful lot of good fellowship between us. We're here just to have a good time doing something we love- playing tennis," Glinz said.

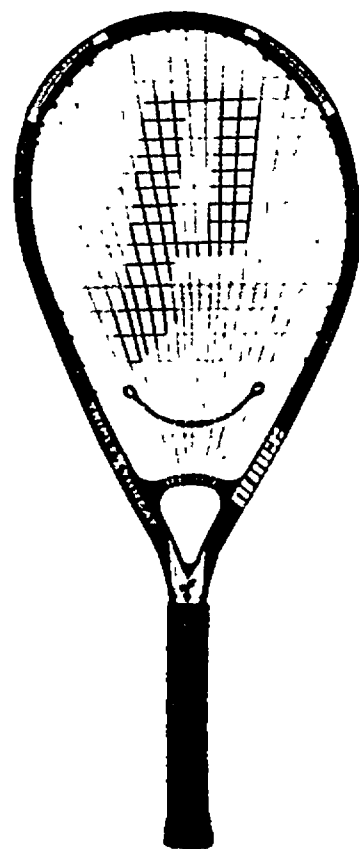

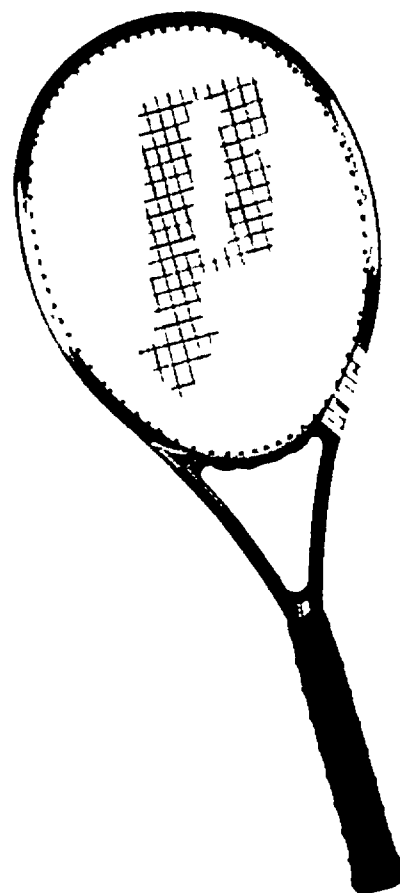

Invest wisely in mutual funds to see the most gain

It's hard to miss reading or hearing about mutual funds lately. Today, a perusal of nearly every newspaper or magazine with a financial section is sure to reveal some mention of mutual funds. The articles often talk about the billions of dollars flowing into mutual funds — \$21 billion in May alone. But where is the money coming from?

WHO OWNS MUTUAL FUNDS?

An estimated 63 million individuals, or nearly 37 million households, own some type of mutual fund, up about 20 percent from 31 million households in 1994. According to a survey conducted by the Investment Company Institute, the typical mutual fund investor is middle class, 44 years old, has financial assets of \$50,000, is employed and is likely to be married. Although the typical mutual fund investor is age 44, Generation X-ers (ages 18 to 30) have a higher portion of their financial assets in mutual funds (38 percent) and tend to concentrate in equity funds. Baby Boomers (age 31 to 49), while having twice as many financial assets as Generation X-ers, have a

smaller percentage of their assets invested in funds (27 percent). Fund investors have long-term goals, with 84 percent citing retirement as their top investment goal.

With so many investors owning mutual funds and so many fund companies touting double-digit returns, you're probably ready to jump on the bandwagon. If you're not already, if you are, consider these tips before you do so.

TIPS FOR MUTUAL FUND INVESTORS

Read the fund's prospectus. This is the fund's selling document and contains information about costs (such as loads, expenses and management fees), risks, past per-

formance and the fund's investment goals. You can get a prospectus directly from a fund or from your financial advisor. Read it carefully before you invest.

Make sure a mutual fund fits in with your investment goals and risk tolerance. Are your investment goals short-term (three to five years) or long-term (five years or more)? Once you determine that, pick a fund with equivalent goals. For example, a fund that invests in three-month government bonds is meant to be held for the short term, while a fund that invests in growth stocks is probably a better choice for long-term investors. You must

also consider the level of risk involved in any mutual fund. Generally, the higher the potential return, the greater risk. Your financial advisor can help you make these decisions.

Look at the performance figures in relative terms. Many funds tout double-digit returns, but there are many questions you should ask about these numbers. Just because a fund returned over 20 percent last year doesn't necessarily mean that it will earn that return in subsequent years. In fact, this year's No. 1 fund could easily become next year's below-average fund. Look at other indicators like its five or 10-year track record, as well as short-term per-

formance. Short term performance dips could indicate that a stellar performer is headed down. Also consider the fund's peer group performance. Good sources for performance figures are on the financial pages of your local daily newspaper or *The Wall Street Journal*.

Select funds that offer you flexibility and portability. Many fund families allow you to exchange your shares for shares of another fund managed by the same advisor. (As with all securities, the value of the fund will fluctuate with market condition. Therefore, an investor's shares, when redeemed, may be worth more or less than their original

cost.) Although you may be charged a fee for this service, it is usually less than transferring assets to a new fund family. Some brokerage firms now offer portability, which allows you to take proprietary funds with you if you change brokerage firms.

As with any financial decision, the advice and counsel of a financial advisor is an invaluable resource in helping you choose investments that suit your life stage and income needs.

A reminder that railroad tracks are dangerous

"Stay Off, Stay Away, Stay Alive"
Twenty-seven people have died and 20 people have been seriously injured in Michigan since 1996, many of them youngsters, because they were on or near railroad tracks. These are 47 needless deaths and injuries.

During the month of May, the Michigan Railroads Association is joining a national effort to inform the public of the dangers of being near the tracks and our message is: "Stay Off, Stay Away, Stay Alive."

Walking along railroad tracks is not

only dangerous but also illegal. Many individuals, particularly children, do not understand the danger associated with activity on the tracks. In addition, railroad tracks, trestles, yards, and equipment are private property. Walking and playing on railroad tracks is trespassing, and can result in jail for 30 days and/or fines up to \$100.

As the school year draws to a close, the Michigan Railroads Association in cooperation with the Michigan Department of transportation and

Michigan Operation Lifesaver, urge parents and educators to pass along the following safety tips to children:

- Trains cannot stop quickly. A freight train traveling 55 miles per hour can take a mile or more to stop.

- Do not walk, run, cycle or operate all terrain vehicles on railroad tracks or rights-of-way.

- Cross tracks only at designated pedestrian or roadway crossings.

- Do not play, fish or bungee jump from railroad trestles. There is only

enough clearance on tracks for the train to pass.

- Do not attempt to hop aboard railroad equipment at any time. A slip of the foot can cost you a limb or your life.

- Always expect a train.

This summer, when it comes to railroad tracks, remember: Stay Off, Stay Away, Stay Alive.

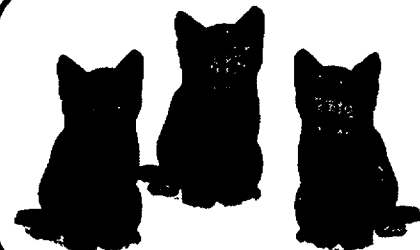

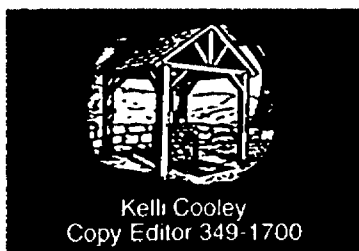

Stories unfold in Figgis' innovative, non-script thriller 'Time Code'

Four stories unfold at once in Mike Figgis' comedy thriller, "Time Code." Deviating from the norms of feature films today, the flick is the first of its kind breaking all bounds while highlighting mystery, comedy and drama.

There is no editing, just a single cut. There are no scripts, just maps for each talented actor to follow. For 93 ground-breaking minutes, the cameras continually roll on four Los Angeles lifestyles mysteriously effecting the other as in real life.

Improvised, yet tightly choreographed movements, synchronize the characters. The audience is challenged to piece together the complex puzzle from four different sources of input. Evolving into a symphony of human emotions, the film builds into a violent crescendo.

The four plots simultaneously unfold on a quadruple-split screen. "Time Code" bases its central elements around an affair, a murder, and the chaos of a Hollywood production office.

Set in real time, the stories intertwine in shocking ways. The characters mysteriously connect building to a final, climactic moment in which they are fused together.

Familiar faces dazzle the screen with their improvisational skills. Salma Hayek is an aspiring actress in the midst of an affair. Stellan Skarsgard plays a philan-

dering motion picture executive. Saffron Burrows is his wife caught between his stress and her own mishaps. Finally, Jeanne Tripplehorn is an angry woman whose actions will change all of their fates.

But no editing? And four plots at one time?

"Time Code" revolutionizes the movie industry via hand-held digital cameras. It is the first feature film shot in one fluid take; the storytelling is never disrupted by editing or cuts.

As opposed to film magazines which can shoot for no longer than 10 minutes at a time, the digital camera can shoot for hours on end.

As the life-blood of the film, hand-held digital cameras also allowed for cheaper production, greater mobility, and a smaller number of crew than there was cast. Each crew member involved felt both the physical harshness as well as the creative rewards. Cameramen have never before filmed for 93 minutes straight nor have they been directly involved with the ideas in staging.

Each day, the cast and crew completed an entire length film, the full 93 minutes on a digital videocassette. Characters slightly altered their style, behaviors, actions, and regular mishaps of everyday life. If Salma Hayek tripped, it became part of the story. If Jeanne Tripplehorn

changed locations, the camera followed her. New takes were simply new full-length, feature films.

"Time Code's" demands were also physically grueling for the cast. Actors found themselves in a self-reliant world away from the typical movie sets filled with make-up designers and personal trainers. Each was responsible for his or her own hair, make-up and costumes. More importantly, each was responsible for much of their own artistic choices concerning movement and emotion.

Having to stay in perfect clockwork with each plot, the 28 actors coordinated their times by wearing synchronized digital watches. Each line said and every movement important to the plot required a specific time slot.

Mike Figgis, writer and director, set the "script" on music paper. Originally used to set flow charts, he used the bar lines to indicate minutes. He foresaw the problem of correlating spontaneous movements with those critical to the plot. Both the cast and crew addressed this topic in great length preparing for every mishap imaginable. Finally, after some 60 takes — meaning 93 minutes for each — the final product emerged.

"Time Code" mastermind, Mike Figgis, was well suited for this revolutionizing piece. A renowned orchestral composer, he is born and bred to thinking in terms of multiple melodies and perfect syn-

chronization. Therefore, the film was not so much directed as it was conducted, harmonizing the four distinct story lines into one.

The cast also includes Xander Berkeley, Viveka Davis, Richard Edson, Glenn Headley, Holly Hunter, Danny Huston, Kyle MacLachlan, Alessandro Nivola, Mia Maestro, Leslie Mann, Laurie Metcalf, Julian Sands, Steven Weber, and more.

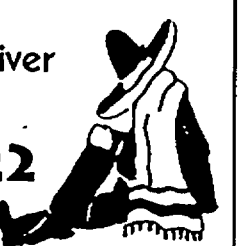

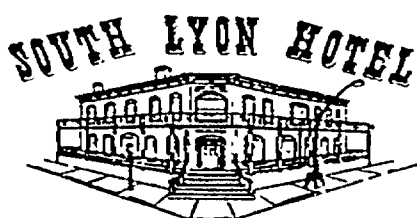

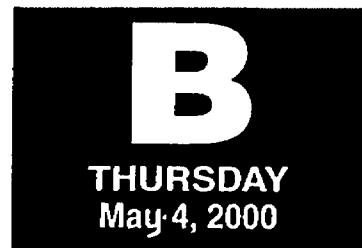

names, sizes and graduation years. Also a big part of the special section was the countless statistics and postseason accomplishments of many of the players.

Local statistician researches Mustang grid history

Now, when I originally began working on this project, I had myself lodged at the Northville District Library for many, many hours. I researched Northville and Novi seasons past with the aid of the microfilm machines. Frankly, my eyes were sore and my mind began to weaken. I needed some help.

So I called upon the historical expertise of Northville football enthusiast Bill McLaughlin, the statistician at Northville and the president of the Michigan Sports Hall of Fame. It was not only a favor he granted, but a favor he relished. Little did I know what I was getting into when I asked him

for help.

He kept in contact with me over the next few weeks, reporting in on what he had found. He answered just about any question I had in relation to Northville's football history. Without him, the Millennium guide wouldn't have been a success.

Well, low and behold what did I receive in my inbox this past week, but a complete compilation of everything McLaughlin had researched. Included in this bind-ed folder were eight sections of statistics, records and award winners. Everything you could ever want or need to know, along with everything you don't need to know

is included.

For instance, did you know:

- That football (at least on record) began in the 1920s and Northville posted a decade mark of 37-40-3 in games played. The decade's best season was 1928, where the team compiled a 7-1 record.

- That the Depression of the '30s did not only hit the country, but Mustang football as well. The school struggled to a 18-46-4 record in the decade and won just four games in the last five seasons. The situation was so bad that according to reports in the Record, school openings were delayed in

1932 and that "to save taxpayers money...53 students in the upper six grades are paying tuition." Also, "the tuition has been cut from \$90 to \$85."

- One good thing that came out of the decade was the team's identity. The school had been referring to its team as "The Orange and Black." But the school held a contest to find a nickname for the school. Eugene Reeves's suggestion "the Mustangs" stuck and the Northville resident was awarded a season ticket to the boy's basketball games.

- After a slightly above-par decade of the '40s, Northville made a name for itself in the '50s. The

Mustangs posted a 65-21-2 record that decade, and in 1958 completed its first perfect season (9-0-0) in school history. At one point late in the decade, Northville won 32 of 33 games in conference play and took home five league crowns in nine years.

- Since 1920, the school has an all-time record of 335-311-21.

- The school's highest point total ever was set in 1950, when the Mustangs trounced South Lyon 70-6.

- Rick Van Buren holds the school record for rushing yards in a game (227) and season (1,126), both set in 1984.

- Anell Kersey holds the school record for career rushing attempts (549) and yards (2,600) and has

The Mustangs lost to Grosse Ile in this tri match, but beat Churchill in a tiebreaker to remain undefeated in the WLAA.

When everything was said and done, Mills and Sekerka's scores of 51 were the team's fourth and fifth totals, which topped Churchill's fifth score of 53. That was enough for the win.

Mouradian and MacDonald were again at the top of Northville's scoring list, with rounds of 42 and 43. Rudy came through with a clutch 45 to propel her team into position to win.

"Heather's really stepped up to the plate for us this year," Murray said. "When Jessie and Kate came in they weren't that pleased, but then Heather came in with a 45 and we were still in the match."

Grosse Ile is the defending Division III state champions and perhaps the top girl's golf program in the state.

Golfer's guide offers lists of golfing possibilities

We may think we know everything there is about the game of golf, but who are we fooling?

The sport itself may be the most difficult to master simply because the object is to put a 1 1/2 inch round object in a four-inch cup which is separated by 150-500 yards of various types of grasses, sand and water. Add to that 14 or more types of clubs in which a person is to use to somehow persuade the dimpled orb into the hole and you might as well stay in the clubhouse sipping on your favorite beverage while watching the big game.

Golf can be a frustrating sport, but the atmosphere and other intangibles don't have to be. In fact, many people enjoy the golf but love the ameni-

ties involved. Hard to believe? It shouldn't be. Michigan has more public golf courses than any other state in the country and it continues to build more.

A few years back a trio of men decided they had no idea where to golf, but more so they didn't know which courses were right for them. So Northville resident Sam Zeppa and his two close friends Greg Morris and Richard Hyrb decided to make the rounds to many of southeastern Michigan's public golf courses, gather information and write a book containing what they learned through their experiences.

"We did it because there was no comprehensive book out there to tell us anything about these courses," Zeppa said.

The three wrote the book *Bogey Golfer's Guide to Public Courses in Michigan* which chronicled over 200 public courses with actual feedback from the three authors. Every course in the book was golfed by at least one of the three authors and rated according to bogey golfer's standards.

"Ninety percent of golfers are bogey golfers who shoot 90 or more per round," Zeppa said.

The original book was published in Nov. of 1995 and there have been three editions published since. The latest edition, the fourth, was made available to the public this past November.

Bogey Golfer's Guide now includes detailed evaluations of 243 public golf courses in Michigan with scorecards, course rankings, location maps and hole-by-hole commentaries. There are 37 new

courses from the previous edition with expanded coverage into six additional counties. The trio even updated their evaluations on 108 previously-criticized courses.

Southeastern Michigan is not the only area of the state covered by the book. Zeppa, Hyrb and Morris have covered all of the thumb area and most of central Michigan, all the way up to Isabella and Mecosta counties.

There is a four-ball rating system used to evaluate the courses. The three have developed a 48-criteria system and give each course a rating based on these criterion. This book is catered to the bogey golfer, not golf professionals.

"If you look at the cliff notes at the beginning of the book, there's a father who talked about taking his son out for golfing and never going to a good course," Zeppa said. "And the father says 'my son says I am still a lousy golfer, but at least I know how to pick a golf course now.'"

Every course has its own niche. One may be a cow pasture, but that may be a nice place for a new golfer to learn.

Just 49 of the 243 courses earned four-ball status, with the majority of courses earning two or three balls. Four of the courses received an overall score of 100 or better, including

St. Ives (103.8), Forest Akers West (103.1), Orchards (100.7) and Hawk Hollow (100.2). Several area courses earned four-ball ratings, including Golden Fox (99.2), Tanglewood (96.9), Mystic Creek (95.6), the Majestic (94.8), Dunham Hills (94.0), Whispering Pines (92.4), Faulkwood (92.3), Links of Novi (91.1) and the Coyote (91.1).

There are also brief descriptions of 37 other "travel courses" as well as over \$200 in coupons in the back of the book. three of the five busiest (rushing attempts) games in history.

Eighty nine times a Northville back rushed for 100-plus yards in a game, most recently achieved five times this past season by junior Brandon Langston. Doug Crisan leads the all-time charge with 11, 100-plus outings.

A young man by the name of Ryan Huzjak holds virtually every passing record at Northville High. Including passing attempts (41) and completions (24) in a game, attempts (226) and completions (127) in a season and passes attempted (585) and completed (312) in a career. He also has the top two season passing yard totals and the career mark of 3,876.

Jerry Imsland (4) and Ben Keetle (2) comprise all the career receiving records.

The 70-6 win over South

Lyon was not only the most points scored in school history, but was also the largest margin of defeat (64) ever. The team's worst loss ever was a 63-0 drubbing by Walled Lake Western in 1971.

As impressive as Northville's 23 points against total in the entire 1974 season was, the ugly side showed that Northville has been held to less than that number offensively three times (13 in both 1931 and 1935, 18 in 1936.)

Ron Rice holds the touchdown record for a game with five in 1963 and Langston set the season mark with 16 this past fall. Dick Bieri's 22 career scores will be Langston's next mission.

The Mustangs have beaten both Milford and Brighton more times (28) than any other opponent. On the flip side, Plymouth (34) has beaten Northville more times than anyone. Despite five-straight losses to Walled Lake Western, the 'Stangs still hold a

17-11 series edge.

Farmington Harrison has always and still has a stranglehold on Northville, winning 29 of 30 of the two team's meetings.

The lists of rivalries, statistics and records go on and on. The more I looked through the "book," the more I was amazed at what McLaughlin has put together.

"It's great history," McLaughlin chuckled. "Some of the best stuff is the history off the field. I had a great time."

McLaughlin said he began looking into this project while working with me this past September. When the football season ended in November, he found himself spending three to four days a week in the Northville District Library. He said some weeks he'd put in five or six days.

He completed his work in March, punched it all up in a nicely packaged Excel document

and shipped off copies to the Northville Record, both the high school and district libraries, current coach Darrel Schumacher, athletic director Larry Taylor, and assistant principal Dennis Colligan.

"This way, when you have a coach here after you and I are long gone, he can't just say his guy set a new record. Everything is right here," McLaughlin said.

He said if anyone is interested in reading into the history of Northville football, they can make a trip up to the district library and look into it. Now that he's finished with the history of Northville football, he said he may try his luck at basketball. So any hoop historians who have any information they'd like to share, give 'ol Bill a call, or e-mail myself here at the Record.

Athletes must use their heads

Concussions and sports, athletes must use their heads to avoid serious injury. U-M expert says.

With spring and summer sports seasons ready to begin, a University of Michigan expert is warning athletes of all kinds: students, amateurs, and professionals alike, to heed new findings about an old sports injury - concussion.

Even a little hit on the head, whether in a Little League baseball game or a pickup round of basketball, can mean big problems, says Edward Wojtyls M.D., a U-M sports medicine specialist who recently led a national committee on concussion treatment guidelines.

He explains that sports-related concussions are far more common, and potentially more dangerous, than most people realize. New research shows that a single brain-bruising knock can cause damage, and that repeated concussions may cause permanent brain injury.

So, Wojtyls advises parents, coaches, and trainers to know the basic signs of concussion, and what to do if they suspect a player has suffered one. There are even checklists to guide them.

"The number of concussions that cause truly critical injuries are few and far between, but every year in North America several kids lose their lives to undiagnosed concussions," he says. "Most concussions are minor, causing short-lived symptoms that clear up pretty quickly," he adds. But others can be life-threatening. Only proper screening on the sidelines and treatment by trained professionals can help decide when or if an athlete can return to the game.

Once an athlete has had a concussion, the risks from additional ones are even higher. "The real danger with some minor concussions is that they can make the brain and nervous system susceptible to another blow," Wojtyls says.

"If it comes along, that can cause the nervous system to deteriorate rapidly. It doesn't happen often but when it does, it's truly an emergency."

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, some 500 deaths annually result from sports-related head trauma; most of these occur among 15- to 24-year-olds. Although concussions are associated mostly with contact sports like football, baseball, soccer and hockey, Wojtyls cautions that even non-contact sports can carry a risk of concussion.

So what, exactly, is a concussion? In general, Wojtyls says, it's an "alteration in brain function usually caused by trauma and it can be anything from dizziness to nausea, to a headache or even loss of consciousness."

How can you tell if you or someone else may have suffered one? Says Wojtyls, "If an athlete is acting a little bit dazed, if their balance is obviously affected, if they're not walking or talking right, or responding properly, all of these things are very important. If these are combined with headache, nausea, vomiting or inability to sleep, that could be very significant."

Most commonly, a "routine" head trauma presents as a mild headache that gradually disappears. However, before returning to sports, anyone who experiences a concussion, no matter what the severity, should be checked by a physician.

But it is especially imperative when symptoms persist, such as a headache that continues more than 15 minutes after the incident, that the injury be evaluated. "Anyone who shows deterioration after the initial event, who has a headache for a while and an hour later is nauseated or is vomiting, should be taken to the emergency room. That's someone we can't take a chance with."

Wojtyls explains that neurological research indicates that the brain sustains lasting "bruises" even after symptoms, even the subtlest

ones, have disappeared. In order for the brain to fully heal, it requires rest, sleep, protection from subsequent impact, and abstinence from alcohol.

He stresses the need for parents, coaches and trainers to know the basic signs of concussion. He said there is a simple sideline evaluation that tests an injured athlete's memory, which is a good indicator because memory is particularly sensitive to alterations in brain function. If a player cannot pass the evaluation, he should be sidelined. The form is available on the American Orthopedic Society for Sports Medicine Web site, www.sportsmed.org, along with an article about concussion management.

Research still continues on the effects of concussion on the brain, its function, and on the best way to evaluate and treat concussion. But even as more information comes in, athletes and those who care about them should use their heads and be cautious about concussion.

HOW TO

Spots and streaks keep windows from sparkling

Q. We have large windows that look out over a picturesque view of the mountains. Keeping these windows clean is a constant struggle. They are badly stained with water spots. I have tried numerous commercial cleaners that clean the glass but do not remove the stubborn water spots. Do you have any recommendations on a product or method that will remove this type of staining?

A. Water-spot staining on windows can be a major problem. Most stains of this type are caused by minerals in the water. Windows that catch splatters from sprinkler systems during landscape watering are particularly susceptible.

Mineral stains can sometimes be eliminated or improved by applying a poultice made by soaking folded paper toweling or a cloth in white vinegar. Tape into place against the window glass, and keep wet with vinegar for a day or so. Remove and wipe dry. If you have a large surface to treat, test in a small area first for benefits. Treating the entire surface of a large glass window will be time-consuming and tedious.

If you experiment with this and it fails to improve the staining, try cleaning with a solution of muriatic acid diluted with water. Use one part acid mixed with eight parts water. If this solution proves too weak, you can increase the acid content up to 50-50 with the water, but it's best to test with weaker solutions first. Full-strength acid can etch your windows and make matters worse.

Pour acid into water, never the reverse. Wear rubber gloves, old clothing and eye protection. Use a sponge or soft bristle brush to apply this solution, being careful not to splash any on the surrounding area. After a few minutes, rinse with clear water.

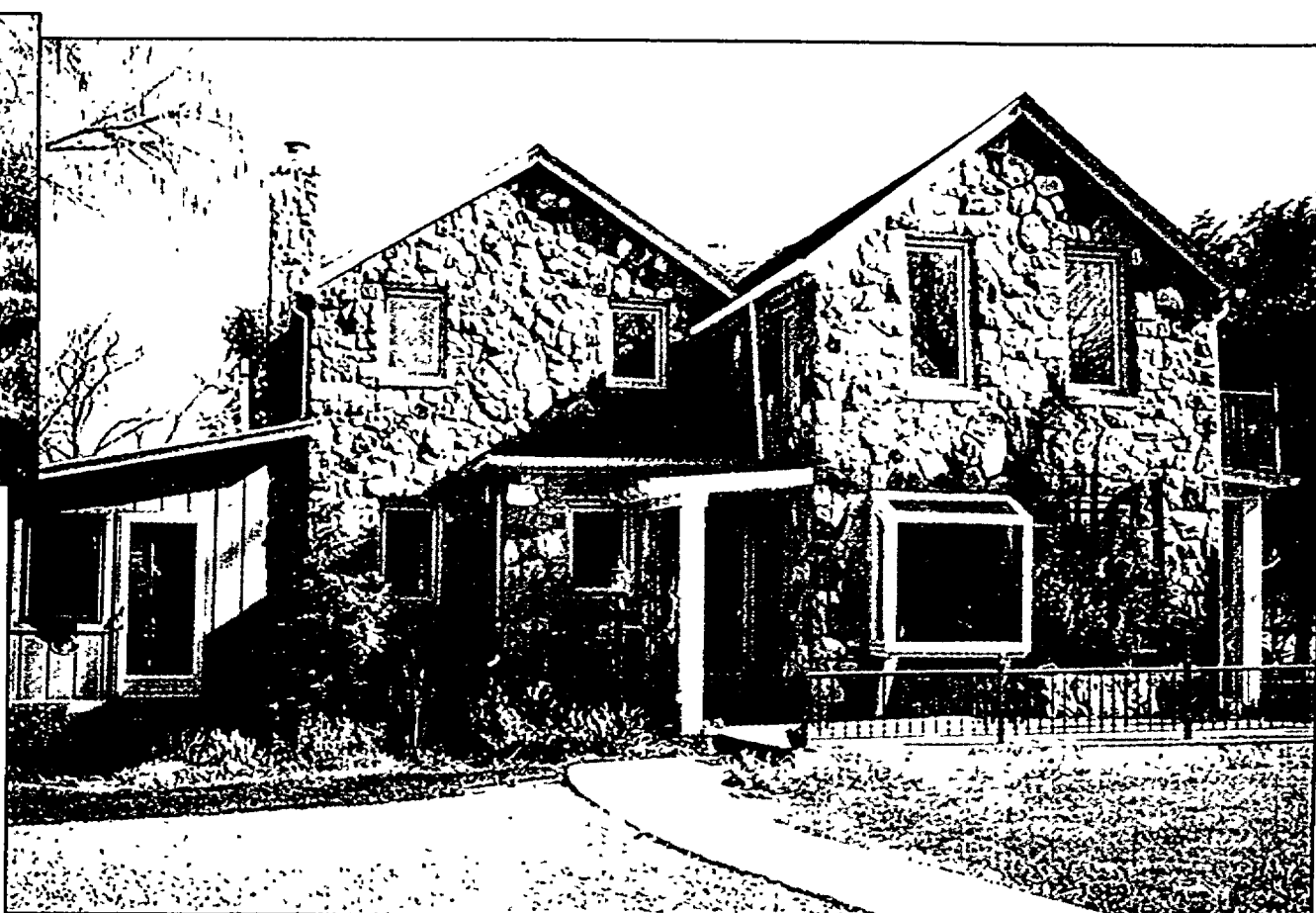
You can also try an industrial-strength cleaner such as CLR, which is effective in removing lime, calcium and rust (available in supermarkets and home centers). The effectiveness of commercial cleaners depends largely on the type of minerals found in your water supply.

If nothing else works, you can remove some of the water stains by buffing the window sur-

building and its grounds evoke an English cottage feel.

With some gentle coaxing, the Davies have made the house their own. In fact, Alice believes, "Once you've lived there a while, the house teaches you." It may be where you want to put the furniture, or a window, or sit and read the morning paper, but eventually you'll know.

Carpeting was removed to reveal original hardwood floors in light oak. In the

dining area, a wall was expanded for a more open look, but rounded arches added to soften the look.

Their antiques are family treasures instead of items from an antique shop. Two chairs in the corner were made by her great grandfather, David Leary. A chifforobe large enough to store all their table linens and dishes was found in the garage when they moved there in 1979, and was refinished. Family heirlooms upstairs include a blue china tea set from her mother. It sits on a shelf made by her grandfather near a doll

house that he built as well.

A cozy room in cedar tongue and groove serves as Hugh's den. Here Alice converted a Murphy's bed into a bookcase. There's also a large butter bowl and a big stick to stir applesauce that came from Alice's childhood on a farm in Armada. She recalls using the stick to help stir the big kettle.

"At the age of nine or ten, I was old enough to make sure it didn't burn on the bottom," she laughs.

One of the most striking features of the

home is the field stone exterior, completed in 1938. The stone was mined from the actual farm. Alice says the flower beds still have some of the remaining chips and pieces. It was part of a major overhaul that began in 1935 after the original home suffered a fire. Local resident, John Scheffler, worked on the project that year. He returned nearly fifty years later during the Milford home tour in 1998, talking to visitors about the project.

Other exterior improvements include wrought iron railing for accents. These are

used on the front and back entry, as well as on the patios upstairs, where Alice enjoys spending her mornings. A stone path that she laid with her friend also blends with the home and its surroundings.

The property also includes and apartment above the two car garage, which they rent out. It was originally built for the caretaker, according to the Davies. There's also a swimming pool a horse barn and a gardening shed in the extensive domain they share with two cats, Thomas and Rudy.

face with a rubbing compound. Use an electric buffer and a light to medium liquid rubbing compound such as that made for fiberglass boats. This will often remove very persistent water deposits, although the abrasions in some of these products can tend to scratch the glass surface and should only be used as a last resort. In the buffing process, use great caution not to apply undue pressure, which might break the glass.

If spotting still remains, it is probable that your window glass is pitted and etched, and the spots can not be removed. If you do have

success in cleaning the glass, apply a protective coating such as Rain-X, Window Maid or a similar product (available at home centers, hardware stores, auto-supply centers, mail-order houses). These products create a surface that dirt will not adhere to as much, and they also help prevent the build-up of water deposits. Protective coatings have to be reapplied periodically.
