



Muddy waters no more

Thornton Creek students study wetlands near school

Every other Wednesday, stu- ately. dents at Thornton Creek get to root in the mud and muck of the streams behind their school and it's all in the name of science.

Thornton Creek students are piloting Global Learning and Observations to Benefit the Environment (GLOBE) program. These petite pioneers are responsible for testing the clarity, temperature. oxygen, conductivity and pH of the wetlands surrounding the school. They then put their results on a web site where scientists all over the world can observe changes in Michigan weather and study its effects. Thornton Creek students join children ages five to 18 from around the world in this project.

this project students see immedi-

"It helps me to remember stuff because I actually get to do it and not just talk about it," said fifth

grader Jonnie Powers. Fifth grade teacher Brigitte Beson said many of the topics the students cover are ones they wouldn't find in a regular lesson plan. In addition they get to enjoy nature and observe things they may not take the time to other-

Each fifth grader is assigned a portion of the wetlands behind the school to observe, Beson said. One of the common things they check is the temperature. If it changes drastically, the students then observe the effects it has on how

However, there are benefits to clear the water is, said fifth grader Amanda Marquette. Students explained they've discovered the change in weather can cause more bacteria production making the water less clear which effects all the "creatures in the pond." said

fifth grader Jeffrey Behmer. The turbidity or clarity of the water is also important to their research said Dayle Pike. During their experiments, they will scoop the water into a turbidity tube and measure the clarity. The more water they can put in and still see to the bottom of the tube, the

Trash pickup costs to jump 20 percent

The garbage collection company trashed time and time again by city of Northville residents during the last 18 months was awarded a contract worth more than \$1.1 million

for four years.
Additionally, starting July 1, costs to residents will increase 20 percent, garbage days will change in the city of Northville and residents will have the option of hiring another contractor. Council plans to hold a public meeting June 5 about the changes and contract letting.

The Northville City Council voted 4-1 to award the contract to Inksterbased Painter and Ruthenberg with the changes. Council member Kevin Hartshorne voted against the

Paul Ruthenberg, co-owner of Painter-Ruthenberg, which has serviced the city of Northville for more than 20 years, said complaints will

The calls will stop coming in," he said. "I will take care of the problems and return my name to good standing.

The city council packet included a listing of more than 150 complaints from the last 18 months from city residents. Complaints ranged from cardboard left at residences to whole streets being missed at a time.

"Clearly, there is a significant dissatisfaction with the service our residents have received over the past two years," according to a report to the council from Jim Gallogly, director of public services and Gary Word, Northville city manager.

Survey shows drug use still big in schools

In the last 30 days, numerous Northville eighth, 10th, and 12th graders have had access to crack cocaine, heroin, or marijuana and tried them, according to the alcohol and other drug survey released May

The voluntary survey shows the number of teens who have used drugs in the past year and what they have been using. These are then compared to the national average, as well as, students from 1992 to the present.

The results show little overall improvement in drug use among teens. However, the numbers did go down in some areas not expected by district administrators, said Director of Special Education Bob Sornson. Regardless, the district has plans to increase awareness and lower the numbers for next year. Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski agreed the issue needs to be addressed.

This is not just a district problem. This is something that the whole community must get involved in if we are going to solve this prob-lem. We all need to come together

and help our kids." he said. Sornson said he intends to send

out letters to parents with a summary of the survey results. Further. he said, he will be discussing the results at a Youth and Family Forum meeting June 15, as well as, suggesting the high school bring more speakers in to address the issues during seminar hours next

Possibly the most startling figures in the report were the statistics on accessibility. Over 90 percent of the 180 twelfth graders taking the survey said they could easily get marijuana; 27.3 percent, crack: 97.8 percent alcohol: and 98.3 percent can get cigarettes. These numbers are slightly lower than last year except for cigarettes and alcohol which increased slight-

But Carolyn Miranda, Student Assistance Program Director at Northville High School said more than the availability of the drugs. the problem is students find drugs like cigarettes, alcohol, and marijuana more socially acceptable.

Youth survives lightning strike on soccer field

A Northville Soccer Association official said practices and games should have been canceled the evening a 12-year-old player was struck by lightning.

The player almost died, however, a quick-thinking soccer coach was able to restart his heart and breathing with CPR, said Northville Township Public Safety Detective Paul Sumner.

The incident happened at 6:06 p.m. on May 11, but should not have happened at all, said Carol Poenisch, the under-six division referee coordinator.

NORTHVILLE CITY

SEA CRUISE: Police officers on patrol near Eight Mile and Center Street observed a vehicle traveling westbound on Eight Mile at 55 mph. The suspect vehicle attempted to turn north onto Center Street but needed to use a large amount of braking power to slow the car through the turn. Officers stopped the car on Center near Hill Street.

The incident occurred at 12:45 a.m., May 12.

Upon speaking with the driver - identified as a 42-year-old Northville woman - officers noticed the odor of intoxicants coming from the vehicle. Officers also saw a foam cup in the driver's console with a straw coming out of it. The woman said she had consumed three "sea breezes" earlier in the evening and had stopped drinking an hour earlier.

After performing poorly on a series of field sobriety tasks, the woman was administered a b eathalyzer test. The results checking in a 0.159. The woman was arrested at the scene.

NOW I KNOW MY ABCs: A vehicle being driven by a 72-year-old Northville

man was observed weaving in its lane on northbound Randolph and then onto westbound Eight Mile Road. Officers stopped the man at the intersection of Eight Mile and Beck.

When officers asked the man to count backwards from 68 to 38, the man said, "You aiready know I've had too much to drink." A breathalyzer test showed the man had a 0.134 blood alcohol level.

OH, THE STRESS: Police on radar patrol on Northville Road, north of Hines Drive clocked a southbound vehicle traveling at 57 mph in a 40 mph zone. Police activated their signal flashers and pursued the suspect vehicle, which did not stop. When the suspect car arrived at the Northville Road intersection, the driver changed lanes, passing two other cars on the right side immediately after the traffic signal turned green.

Officers then grabbed the woman by the wrist and forcibly removed her from the vehicle, handcuffed her, and placed her in a patrol car.

Police officers contacted the woman's husband, who said his wife was not deaf, but had been under much stress and pressure as of late.

What should be done at Rural Hill? Mill Race Matters

Historic cemetery is expected to be at capacity within three years

A much needed and proposed expansion of Rural Hill Cemetery has city officials and area residents voicing grave concerns.

One thing is certain though, the cemetery needs to expand now or face being filled. In just a few

We have less than 200 grave sites left to be sold in the cemetery," said Gary Word. Northville city manager. That gives us about two to two and a half years before we run out."

The city has spent or plans to spend \$125,000 to get the project going, but it's being held up by the township as officials on the planning commission continue to mull over cemetery ordinance changes. Additionally, not all neighbors are happy with the proposed expansion.

The very existence of the cemetery and relevant graves, road, mausoleum, columbarium and office buildings degrade signifi-cantly the values of surrounding residents' property," said Elaine Haas, 617 Fairbrook Drive, in a letter to the township board of trustees. Haas said she paid for a study to determine the effects of a cemetery on surrounding resi**A LONG HISTORY**

Rural Hill Cemetery was started by the Rural Hill Cemetery Association after it purchased 20 acres of farmland for use as a cemetery in 1885. The association sold the land to the village of Northville in 1948 after it was determined members could no longer provide the management, maintenance, and expansion needed for the facility. One-third of the cemetery is in the city of Northville while the rest is in Northville Township.

Budget allocation for cemetery maintenance at Rural Hill Is more than \$115,000, however one-half of the revenue generated from lot sales proves less than 25 percent of the revenue needed to maintain the cemetery annually. The city's general fund subsidizes the operational needs of the cemetery. For the current fiscal year, that amount is \$73,605.

For the next fiscal year, the city has tentatively allocated \$100,000 for the first phase of cemetery build-out costs in addition to \$25,000 in preliminary planning costs. Additionally, 50 percent of the sale of each grave is dedicated to the perpetual care fund to help defray the cost of maintenance when the cemetery has no more grave sites to sell.

With less than 200 sites available for the public in the platted areas of the cemetery and less than 65 sites for veterans, city officials said the time is right for expansion.

But because the cemetery stretches to Seven Mile Road on the north, the only way to expand is south, into about six acres of undeveloped land in Northville Township.

The city estimates it could fit up to 4.200 grave plots on the site and extend the life of the cemetery by 40 years.

But township officials and neighbors in the area are making the expansion difficult, Word said.

AN UPHILL CLIMB

Maureen Osiecki, Northville Township director of planning. said the issue is being looked at now because the township is lacking guidelines for several aspects

of cemetery growth.

Word said the first proposal. which was rejected by the township board of trustees, was too

prohibitive of cemetery growth. What they've proposed unduly restricts the development of the cemetery," Word said. "It places the burden on the city not to impact neighbors even though the cemetery was there before the development."

In a report to the township planning commission, the city listed several concerns about the ordinance changes including setbacks too restrictive; application of standards denies or restricts use of 50 percent of the build-out area: excessive and inappropriate landscaping requirements beyond what is practical.

The city of Northville respectfully requests that the Northville Township board of trustees rejected the proposed provisions regarding the development/expansion of existing cemeteries," the report to the township said.

The Northville Township board of trustees did reject the first proposal of standards submitted by the planning commission and turned the matter back over to the commission.

Richard Allen, co-chairman of the township planning commission, didn't return telephone calls to the Northville Record.

Osiecki said she expects the second proposal to come before the planning commission. May 23.

But time is wasting. Word said. We need to begin construction this year," he said.

Construction begins soon on a project promising to pave the way for future bicyclists and walkers in Northville Township.

Don Weaver, director of public services in Northville Township. told the Northville Township board of trustees that Wayne County officials expect work on a major sec-

tion of a bike path to begin in June. The section is located between Northville Road and Haggerty

We want to give residents a safe way to get from one park to another," said Maureen Osiecki, director of planning for Northville Township. We also have found walking to be a popular leisure time activity.

As a result, township planners have mapped out areas they plan to pave in the future. The end results, according to a pathway status report compiled by the

township.
We're planning to connect as many as we can. Ösiecki said.

New developers in the township are required to put pathways on property they build on, she said. The township and county are working on filling in whatever gaps may exist.

For example, the area between Northville Road and Haggerty Road is developed. As a result, the cost for the project will covered by a grant from the Michigan Department of Transportation and a porttion by the township? Several homeowner associations falong the route are helping with the costs

through escrow accounts set up as long as 10 years ago. (1904).

The estimated cost is about \$300,000 with about \$12,000 to be paid by the township.

Sue Hillebrand, Northville Town^u ship board of trustees clerk, 'said' the project is a much needed one.

"I am a big proponent of paths through the community," Hille-brand said. "We need to make our community more walkable.

Hillebrand said more and more people moving into the area ask about pathways.

There is no safe way for kids and families to get to the west side of the community from the east." she said.


Dan Foster, manager of D&D Bicycle Service Inc., 121 N. Center St., said the trails will be a welcome addition to the community.







State considers sales tax holiday

Cutting the sales tax as a way to return Michigan's budget surplus to taxpayers has certain advantages, House Tax Policy Chair Nancy Cassis told her committee Tuesday, May 9.

"It never leaves taxpayers' wallets," said Rep. Cassis, R-Novi. "They don't have to wait for a refund next April or to get a tax credit. The money is never sent to the government in the first place."

Cassis is pushing for the creation of a sales tax holiday, two weeks around the Labor Day weekend when clothing purchases would be exempt from Michigan's 6 percent state sales tax.

Committee members are receptive to the proposal, although they are asking that the cap on the cost of clothing eligible for exemption be trimmed from \$500 per item to

Still, if enacted, the tax cutting measure would save taxpayers an estimated \$16 million per year, according to House Fiscal Agency analyses.

That's money Cassis said she believes the state will recover. because state consumers will like spend that same cash elsewhere.

They'll go out to dinner or buy a piece of jewelry they hadn't planned on buying," she said. Similar tax holidays enacted in Texas. New York and Florida have not cost the state coffers as much as was originally projected, due in part to that extra spending consumers tend to do when they save a few dollars.

If the committee acts quickly on the bill and it gets a good review from the full House and Senate, Cassis said she hopes the holiday can be in effect for the coming Labor Day

would need to be done to satisfy contract specifications." Gallogly

A motivating factor for workers to do a better job is that the city will charge the contractor \$15 for each pick-up missed and not picked up within 24 hours. Gallogly said the company will take the money direct-

by out of its employees' salaries.

Additionally, Gallogly said moving the garbage days to Monday for homes north of Eight Mile Road and Tuesday for those south will give the company and city time to deal with any problems.

Workers and city residents will be instructed as to the rules for garbage collection.

There is going to be training on their end for what is acceptable in our community and there is going to be some training in our community to get residents to follow basic rules," Gallogly said.

The city received three bids for a four-year solid waste collection program, April 27. The bids came back higher than current costs.

Residents will pay \$12 a month— up from \$10 — for the next two years starting July 1. Had the coun-

cil approved Waste Management, the second lowest bidder, residents would have been charged \$15 a month for the next two years.

According to the report, "if city council awards this contract to the low(est) bidder, a 20 percent rate increase to all residential customers will be required. If council chooses to award a contract to the second low bidder ... a 50 percent rate increase will be necessary.

At the same meeting the changes were approved, however, another motion was passed giving residents the option to opt out of the service and hire another contractor. The measure passed 4-1 with Hartshorne voting against it.

Gallogly said the option serves the community two ways. The first way it helps the community is by giving frustrated residents an alternative. The second way is that the city doesn't charge a tax that hasn't been approved by the voters.



Northville principals will have a some extra change in their pockets next pay day since a recent salary increase and five year contract was approved May 9.

The school board and superintendent Leonard Rezmierski adjourned into an executive session to discuss the final ratifications of the contract which the

board approved. The final settlement offer includes a 17 percent increase in salaries across the board, in exchange for three extra days of work over the next four years. The settlement offer allows for full retroactive compensation for the 1999-2000 school year.

The contract will go into effect June 30.

The raise and contract extension ends 10 months of negotiations for the district with the Northville Association of School Administra-

"We're pleased that we have settled on a contract that is fair and equitable," said Northville High School Principal and School Administrators president Tom

According to the settlement, the principals will receive a 4 percent raise this year. According to business and finance director John Street, the administrators have already been given a 2 percent raise this year and will be retropayed for the other 2 percent, giv-

ing them a total of 4 percent raise

That will be followed by a 3.5 percent raise for the 2000-2001 school year as well as the 2001-2002 year. They then will receive 3 percent in the 2002-2003 and again in the 2003-2004 school

The principals will also have an additional three working days during the 2001-2004 school years. Those days will be determined by the administrators.

Further, any administrator hired by July 1, 2000 will be offered only Blue Cross / Blue Shield PPO Health Insurance.

Rezmierski said he was especially pleased the district was able to negotiate a five-year contract as they did with teachers in April 1999. This means we will not have to

go through these negotiations again until 2004 which allows us to focus on what we are really here for, which is to educate kids," he

Johnson said the Association was also pleased, despite the contract falling short of what had been

originally asked. Johnson said the association had hoped to widen the gap between the highest paid teacher and the lowest paid admin-Istrator. However, that was not the case as much as they would have liked. Johnson said.

"We want to be able to attract new administrators to the district. he said. "We weren't as successful as we might of liked there was some improvement but not as much. But we'll go on from here."

Rezmierski said the district did its best to accomplish the goal but there was a limit as to what it

On the other hand, Johnson said the Assocation wanted to narrow the gap between the principals and the central office administrators. What we do in the buildings in terms of day-to-day discipline is critical to the success of the district and they demonstrated that in our new salary package," Johnson

Rezmierski said he was pleased the board approved the changes and hoped the salary package reflected the importance of administrators to the district.

"These are good people." Rezmierski said. "We rely on them. This (settlement) is a good thing and it's good recognition for a job well done.

been little rainfall before the storms of last week and a relatively dry winter so their samples have

However, those results are exactly what will help scientists and researchers track Michigan's changing weather patterns.

These results help them keep track of big sweeping changes in weather and if. for instance. Michigan suddenly had a big weather change they could figure out why it was so out of whack. It really serves as a good barometer. Beson said.

As the school year closes, she said there were some things they learned and some they needed to work on in future classes such as testing how much dissolved oxygen there is in their ponds. Beson said they are very much the stu-

dents' ponds. They are very territorial about their area," she said. "They notice every little change, even in the surrounding areas.

Additionally, the students have started thinking about the types of projects they would like to work on within the program. Powers wants to know how high the pH level of the water can go and what makes it do that while Pike wants to know how clear the water could

District gives its charge to CHAC

The Northville school board approved guidelines for the Citizens Health Advisory Committee (CHAC) to follow while they review the high school health curriculum at a board meeting Tuesday.

The CHAC voted not to make any decisions May 4, on the high school health curriculum until the school board's approval.

The CHAC originally was a recommending body created two years ago to analyze the health courses for the district. Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski sent the curriculum back to the committee recently due to parent concerns. Rezmierski recommended giving the committee a year to review research and information for the class before making a final recommendation.

The board's charge, among other things, allows the committee to create the syllabus and materials for the health class, Rezmierski

They will be choosing the course materials and designing the syllabus, however, most of that work has already been done by the teachers so they will already have a framework in place," he said.

Some members of the CHAC voiced their discomfort with this idea before the charge was approved.

I'm afraid we are treading into territory that is a teacher's job." said Moraine Elementary Principal Mary Kay Gallagher. I have concerns about turning over a materials search and writing curriculum to an advisory committee.

That sentiment was echoed by parent and registered nurse Susan Rice, who said she would be relieved if the board decided the committee did not have to develop the health curriculum.

Northville Education Association President Greg Bergen also spoke to members of the CHAC and the board and expressed his displeasure with the idea of the committee designing curriculum.

If the committee is going to design a course, what do you need teachers for?" he said.

However, Secretary Tom Gudritz said the instructional staff will be an intregal part of designing the curriculum and have done most of the work for the curriculum already. The parents and clergy will simply be advising how the curriculum is implemented.

Additionally, the charge states the committee will work with the Office of Instruction to review research regarding the delivery of health education and how to encourage responsible behavior. They will then use this research to recommend whether the district should offer a course with content going beyond what the law requires. To do this, they will recommend the general content areas taught in the course.

the course should be offered, they will then advise the board whether they think it should be taught as an elective or mandatory course. If the course is required, they will have to analyze and report on the advantages and disadvantages of all their options. These options include having an opt out for the sex ed portion, an opt out for the entire course with a student's parent(s) taking responsibility for teaching this material to their student, or they can offer alternates to the sex ed units such as *abstinence only" or "comprehensive sex

education. The committee will also have to consider and make a recommendation on whether the emotional effects of sexual activity should be discussed, adding a parent component as well as on how to deal with issues arising in a mixed gender/age class. Further, the charge states the committee should consider the involvement of health professionals in the course design," when carrying out their charge.

After the committee has done this, the board wants a written report on their findings. Once this has been accepted and acted on by the board, the committee with the Office of Instruction will develop curriculum for the course or courses.

The board will ultimately have the final say on everything. Rezmierski said.

The board also gave the committee some general guidelines such as meetings will be open to the public: the committee must keep the board and community updated of its progress; they must make their decisions in a timely manner: and they have to attempt to reach decisions by consensus. However, majority vote will prevail.

After the CHAC makes its recommendation, the curriculum will go to the school board instructional sub committee and on to the full board, if approved. Rezmierski said it will never have to formally go to the District Curriculum Committee because there are so many common members and the CHAC will have kept everyone

The CHAC's next meeting is tentatively scheduled for June 8 and will be in the conference room at the Main Street board office, 501 W. Main Street, from 4-6 p.m. However, if they do not meet before the summer, their next meeting is scheduled for Sept. 6 from 4-6 pm.

$\overline{\textit{Committee opted}}$ to wait for charge before moving on

Though the Citizens Health Advisory Committee (CHAC) decided not to make any decisions without their charge from the board, there were several items Assistant Superintendent Linda Pitcher had on the agenda for discussion May 4.

The committee had several logistical items of business on the agenda, but did not discuss them because they wanted to wait for their charge from the board.

This included roles and responsibilities created by Pitcher, but not necessarily part of the charge. She suggested committee members read two to three articles containing research on health issues provided to all the members and give a report to the

Pitcher also suggested to a member of the committee that if they have to miss a meeting, to contact their alternate counterpart so they will be represented at the meeting. Further, she wants them to report committee progress and decisions to the PTA each parent member represents. They would then have to report to the CHAC in terms of the PTA's response.

She also told them the goal of the committee is to reach consensus.

However, Rev. Kent Clise said he did not think consensus was a good idea.

"I am hesitant about consensus, he said. There is a possibility we could be held hostage by a consensus and not make any progress.

He went on to say consensus may be an unrealistic goal with so many people of so varying opinions. He said he would like to see a majority vote and would live with the outcome.

To me, once the vote's been taken that's it. That's the committee's will and you go along

with that Rev. Clise said. On the other hand, registered nurse and parent Susan Rice said she has had some experience and thinks it could work if everyone was committed to the

"It takes everyone being honest," she said. "The center of consensus is to have a bottom line. I think our bottom line is best for our kids. I think we can do it. We have to at least try it."

Pitcher said consensus as the board and herself sees it is, "I might not agree with everything we have decided, but I can live with it," she said. If in attempting to reach consensus, she feels it is blocking the group's progress. Dr. Pitcher said she will call for a

Additionally, Pitcher asked for a volunteer to write an article from the minutes of the meetings for each PTA newsletter. This volunteer will also send a copy to high school technology facilitator Donna Shannon so she may add it to the district's web site.

Pitcher also proposed a list of speakers for the meetings. This list included a team building session the first meeting in September with consultant Joyce Fouts from Wayne County Regional Educational Services Agency (RESA). Other suggested speakers include Dr. Cheryl Jones; a parent in the community, Nurse Sue Hudson: who has experience working with students in Northville, high school counselors: Dr. Adrea Kenyon Unitis, a RESA consultant, and Director of Special Education Bob Sornson to discuss the 2000 Alcohol and Other Drugs Survey.

Small group discussions were suggested as a way to analyze the basic units of the curriculum. Pitcher said. She said with a group this large, it would be nearly impossible for everyone to share their input. So she suggested dividing each of the units up into small groups. These small groups, pending the charge from the board, would develop and choose materials for each section. These groups will then present this material to the



Drug use remains steady, study shows

There is a misconception in the crowds they run in that these drugs are harmless because they are more socially acceptable," she said.

The survey seems to reflect this. The drug of choice for eighth graders seems to be alcohol with 16 percent of the 375 students surveyed taking a drink within a month prior to the survey.

The number of teens drinking in Northville increases at the tenth grade, when it jumps to 33.9 percent out of the 241 students surveyed.

Sornson noted overall that the numbers for the tenth grade appear to be on the rise. For instance, the use of hallucinogens went down in the eighth and twelfth grades but not in the tenth. Further, their numbers were up in the daily and heavy use of selected drugs as well as in the use of tranquilizers and stimulants.

Miranda said there are several things students and staff at the high school have done to improve these numbers and teens perceptions of these drugs in particular. The students group Students Against Drunk Driving (SADD) changed their name to read Students Against Destructive Deci-

"We didn't want to send the message 'well it's okay to drink as long as you don't drive'." Miranda said. "We wanted students to know that as long as they are underage, they should not drink.

Furthermore, in addition to the school's zero tolerance policy, students have also voluntarily signed a DRUG USE IN NORTHVILLE SCHOOLS

Another point of concern in the survey. Sornson said, was the increased amount of drug use among the same class of students. In 1996, the class of 2000 were eighth graders and only 8.3 percent reported they used marijuana in

the month the survey was taken. Now as seniors, their numbers jumped to 33 percent, saying they've smoked marijuana in the 30 days prior to the survey.

What worries me is that their numbers in this class started high and they are continuing to move in that direction," Sornson said.

Additionally, Sornson said school

seemed to be the least likely setting for use and peers continue to be the ones students would turn to most if they needed help.





Boy recovering well from lightning accident on field

can resume playing. However, if there is one within 15 minutes, the coach or referee must cancel practice.

Sumner said the 12-year-old male was hit by lightning during a soccer event at a soccer field at Northville Christian Assembly.

Northville Christian Assembly.

As a result, Sumner said, his heart stopped beating and he was not breathing. A coach administered CPR to the male, whose name is being withheld due to his age.

"The coach performed CPR on the 12-year-old and saved his life." Sumner said.

That's exactly what the boy's mother said late Tuesday evening. In a phone interview with the Record, the boy's mother said her son suffered no major injury from the incident, but that he would not be returning to school until next week.

She also said didn't blame the coach for what happened to her son. Rather, she credited him with performing CPR — the lifesaving process that probably saved her son's life.

"It was a freak accident," she said. "Nothing more."

The woman also said some 20 calls were placed to the township's 911 response system once the lightning struck.

Township police and the fire department arrived during the storm and the boy was transported to Si. Mary's Hospital in Livonia. He was treated and released during the weekend and was able to walk into the Northville Township Public Safety Department, May 15, and thank them for helping. Sumner said.

According to a statement by Northville Parks and Recreation. "the injured individual was participating in a Northville Soccer Association practice session." Northville Soccer Association is an independent, volunteer non-profit organization that provides the coaches, officials, game and practice schedules, coach training awards and other related activities. Northville Parks and Recreation provides registration processing, field maintenance and some clerical services.

Mary Clough, another soccer coach at the field during the same time, said she felt the coach did what any other coach would have done.

At no time was there any doubt that it was safe for those boys to be out there. She said.

Clough said she was at the field

to coach an under 6 division girls soccer team around 5 p.m. At the time, she said the weather was "a little unpredictable." as she saw lightning about every 10 minutes. She said she had the girls on her team wait to start their practice to see if the weather wall delean.

see if the weather would clear.

Around 5:30 Clough said she had not seen another bolt and the sky was clearing, but she canceled practice anyway.

"There was no reason to have practice if they were only going to get to play for 15 minutes." she said. "But the clouds were moving out and the sun was shining through, so there was no reason

for others not to have practice."
Clough said she and her son

stayed in their car until his soccer practice at 6 p.m. Clough said she heard a weather report on the radio saying the storm was moving south toward Milan so she "didn't worry about sending her son off to his practice." As she stood outside of her car in the open parking lot, she saw the lightning and all what

"There was this explosion of bright light and a horrendous sound. The earth moved and all the boys just went down." she

Players told her afterwards their

bodies shook with the electricity and even Clough was thrown into her car.

"Everyone's first instinct was to get those boys off the field." she said. "It was miraculous no one clse was hurt or worse."

Clough said panic set in as parents grabbed for cell phones to call for help but got no answer because of the electricity in the air. But finally she said someone got through as a neighbor and coaches ran to help the fallen boy who had not gotten up.

"The ambulance and fire trucks came so fast and they took really good care of him." she said.

However. Poenisch said she believes despite everyone's best efforts, the children's safety should have been the coaches's first concern.

Additionally, she said there is a great deal of pressure to continue games and practices no matter what.

"Soccer is really big in this state and especially in this town." she said. "There is always a push to keep going."

Reep going."

Poenisch said she hopes parents realize they need to exercise their rights to remove their children from situations such as these if they feel it is dangerous.

Clough said she believes it was safe to play, and she will continue to coach and allow her children to play. She said she has faith in the coaches and referees in the association due to their certification and training they receive from Northville Parks and Recreation.

Tve learned to respect it (lightning)," she said. "It's just a miracle; a miracle."

That was the dilemma the Northville city council was strapped with this week, when it awarded a four-year contract to Inkster-based Painter and Ruthenberg for trash pickup.

A seemingly routine decision, but not when you consider that the company had been inundated with phone calls from unhappy residents who said their trash either hadn't been picked up properly or in some cases, not at all. Couple that with a bid that was a full 20 percent higher than what residents had been paying for the service, and it certainly seems as if the city was giving more money to an undeserving company.

Even Painter and Ruthenberg officials themselves acknowledged the mistakes made in the past, but offered to atone for them in exchange for a contract being awarded.

Words alone may not have been enough to convince the council members — save for member Kevin Hartshorne, who voted against awarding the contract — that Painter and Ruthenberg was the correct choice. But faced with the reality that the next -lowest bid was a full 50 percent pricier, what choice did the council really have?

With reservations, we think the

alk about being stuck council made the right choice, even if it really didn't have an attractive one. In theory, Painter and Ruthenberg knows Northville, as it has been the garbage pickup service of the city for the last 20 years. Couple that with the several "do-it-or-else" addendums the city tacked on to the contract, and we're hopeful that service will improve.

Public works director Jim Gallogly and city manager Gary Word said Painter and Ruthenberg would face a number of qualifiers to the \$1 million deal, including:

- A \$15 penalty for every resident whose trash is not picked up on the scheduled day, nor is picked up within 24 hours of the scheduled
- Moving the garbage days to Monday for homes north of Eight Mile Road and Tuesday for those south will give the company and city time to deal with any problems, and;
- Allowing residents the option to choose to contract on their own with another garbage collection agency.

We're keeping our fingers crossed that the council has made the right decision and that voting the community's treasury was the best choice to make. At the first sign of a group of black bags left along the curb without a truck in sight, though, the questions are certain to flare up like the smell of old

Politics in the courts? Judge for yourself

Justices of the Michigan Supreme Court are elected statewide. Candidates are nominated respectively at the state Republican and Democratic conventions, but they appear on the November ballot as "non-partisan" judicial can-

Most voters have no idea who they're voting for, much less the qualifications and judicial philosophy of the candidates. Moreover, in recent years, enormous amounts of money - as much as \$1 million for one campaign - have been raised to finance these campaigns, giving the distinct impression that justice in Michigan's highest court is up for sale to the highest bidder/contributor. And, given the increasingly partisan cast the court and its decisions have demonstrated in recent years, it's not surprising the political rhetoric has become increasingly shrill and unseemly.

This is a terrible system. Consider but two current examples.

Last week. I received a visit from Wayne County Circuit Court Judge Edward Thomas, who almost certainly will be a Democratic Party nominee for Supreme Court Justice. Judge Thomas, who worked his way through college and law school on the assembly line, has an excellent reputation as a thoughtful, balanced and thorough judge. In fact, he was ranked among the top 10 judges in the Detroit metro area in a 1991 article in Detroit Monthly magazine.

I asked Judge Thomas what the judicial canons of ethics allowed him to talk about while campaigning. Not much, it turns out. He can talk about decisions he has made, but only if the case is all over and not before an appellate court. He can discuss his judicial philosophy, but he can't talk about any matter of substance that might ever come before the Supreme Court.

After our conversation, I made a note to myself: "Ed Thomas is real nice guy. He's smart.

decent, thoughtful, down to earth. Too bad he's running for Supreme Court.

What I meant is that Judge Thomas is about to be caught in the maw of big-time judicial politics in Michigan. He'll have to raise tons of money, campaign day in and day out throughout the state, take lots of abuse from his opponents, and suffer a gag rule that insures he talks in irrelevancies. When Election Day rolls around this November, it's a sure thing he will be nearly as unknown across the state as he is

So whether he wins or loses is little more than a crap shoot. That's a lousy way to pick a Supreme Court Justice.

Example two has to do with the flap that arose last week surrounding Robert Young, Jr., who was originally appointed to the Michigan Supreme Court by Governor John Engler and who almost certainly will be a Republican Party nominee for election this fall.

Young, who is African-American, was the target of a flyer put out by the Michigan Democratic Party and distributed at the recent National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) dinner in Detroit. The flyer asserted that Judge Young is a "staunch believer that Brown vs. Board of Education was wrong." ("Brown" is the landmark case outlawing racial segregation in schools.)

Young promptly wrote Mark Brewer, Democratic State Chairman, saying that "this statement is a lie...an attempt to create an ugly. racist campaign to impugn me as Michigan's only sitting African American justice. Such virulent race-baiting has no place in our political discourse." Young pointed out that he is on the record (in an Aug. 22, 1999 editorial in the Detroit News) as "a beneficiary (of Brown) - and I think society is a beneficiary - of ending segregation." He also demanded a retraction and a public apology, as well as threatened a lawsuit.

Brewer says Young told a group of lawyers last year that "Brown was wrongly decided." And. indeed, it's been a long line of argument among conservative jurists that lots of U. S. Supreme Court decisions are based on "sociology" rather than hard law. So it's entirely possible Young may agree with the substance of the Brown vs. Board of Education opinion while at the same time disagreeing with the juridical logic the Supreme Court used to reach its decision.

So what are we to make of the whole brouhaha? Just this. It's the most current example of how politicizing the selection of Michigan Supreme Court Justices has resulted in partisan rhetoric that is shrill and unseemingly.

Don't hold your breath, but wouldn't it be great if all the candidates, Democratic and Republican alike, actually said what they no doubt think and condemned our system of electing Justices for the fraud it really is?

Maybe we were better with old Ameritech

Remember Bob Gosselin? He's the state representative from Troy, a Republican, who is so pro-business that he walked into a firestorm last year with his proposed House Bill 4777. A favorite issue of the Michigan Chamber of Commerce, Gosselin argued then that when business people go into a new community, they shouldn't have to deal with a lot of different and unusual local rules.

Municipal officials obviously saw it differently. And regardless of where you stand on that issue, let's just consider it evidence that Gosselin is pro-business.

So what has him talking like Ralph Nader these days?

What business could behave so badly that Gosselin has begun referring to its business practices as "sleazy?" What business could incur his wrath to the degree he concludes it has become "belligerent" and "abusive" of its own

Could it be the same company that spurred another good Republican, Rep. Patricia Birkholz, R-Saugatuck, to tell Ameritech vice president Bob Cooper in a hearing last week that when she is in her district, attending town hall meetings and at church gatherings, she hears complaints from constituents about one thing and one thing only -- the phone company?

Could it be the same company that spurred a free-market governor like John Engler to propose more regulation and price controls? Price controls? From John Engler? The same John Engler who has privatized and deregulated everything he could get his hands on in Michigan over the last 10 years?

"I'm tired of waiting." he said when he proposed a 5 percent immediate reduction in telephone rates. I want Michigan customers to get a rate cut now.

When Engler urged the Legislature to temporarily put Ameritech back under the control of the Public Service Commission, because five years of deregulation in this state have failed to produce any meaningful competition, it should be seen as rather shocking.

But if Ameritech has ticked off customers in Michigan, it is because of stories like the one coming out of Gosselin's office this week. His legislative aide. Kristina Pavelich is an Ameritech customer and she has voice mail on her home phone. The charge for that service is \$4.95 per month, but without her consent, she says, Ameritech in April decided to improve the service to Voice Mail Plus, costing \$9.95 per month. When she called to protest, she received another sales pitch. When she insisted her service be returned to basic. Ameritech said it would have to charge \$7.50 to "downgrade" the

That's right, Ameritech said it would charge \$7.50 to take off a service enhancement she didn't ask for.

either upgrading services without permission or charging to downgrade them again. By the way, such aggressive sales pitches recently earned SBC, the company that just bought up Ameritech, a \$44 million fine in California for what that state called "marketing abuses."

It is happening here because, five years after deregulation, no real competition for local phone service exists in Michigan. Ameritech continues to control the vast majority of phone lines here. What Ameritech has become, according to Rep. Mike Kowall, R-White Lake, is an "unregulated monopoly.

Back in 1995, when the state last addressed telecommunications law, it deregulated. The Public Service Commission lost authority over local phone companies. Even the creator that bill, Sen. Mat Dunaskiss, R-Lake Orion, according to his aides, admits deregulation here has been a fallure.

Now Ameritech is pushing to have the state buy into Dunaskiss' latest incarnation, SB 1193. which would remove the last vestiges of state control over the phone company.

Engler and House Republicans prefer HB 5721, sponsored by Rep. Mary Anne Middaugh, R-Paw Paw, and HB 4804 by Rep. Marc Shulman. R-West Bloomsteld. They would simply return local telephone service to the control of the PSC until it determines that true competition has been established here, or until the year

We've tried it Ameritech's way. More of the same won't likely work any better. Clearly it is time for another approach.

Rethinking needed for pheasant program

I recently read the article about pheasants coming to Moraine Ele-mentary School in the Northville Record. Please read and give some serious consideration to the following comments.

The Nature Conservancy, generally considered a well respected and premier source for information relating to the environment, states that (1) habitat loss and (2) the spread of non-native plants and animals are the top two reasons why we are experiencing great loss of native species in our country.

Pheasants are not native to the U.S. and in no way have ever been part of our native natural Michigan. They have no history of developing through the past thousands of years along with native Michigan plants and animals. Raising and releasing non-native species, be they plants or animals, can only be considered detrimental to habitat area and to the native species which are desperately trying to survive. Non-native species wreak great havoc on native Michigan ecosystems by interrupting and greatly disturbing the centuries-old connections between all native plants and animals, and by outcompeting with native species. In effect, raising and releasing pheasants into Michigan habitat is no different than teaching the students to raise and then release

seeds into the area for growing purple loosestrife or garlic mus-

Please seriously consider what is being taught to those students. Currently, they are learning to disrupt native ecosystems and are doing nothing to assure the survival of our native plants and animals. Hopefully, instead, they'll be taught to have respect for and knowledge of Michigan native species and how these very species need immediate assistance in order to still be around when these children are adults.

Thanks for your time and attention to this very serious matter.

and Canton must be considered. However, the Election Bureau advised Mr. Selinsky and Mr. Bec that they need only obtain 40 signatures apiece, based on the population of only Northville and Plymouth, to be placed on the ballot. The voter population of Northville Township. Plymouth Township. and Canton was erroneously excluded. According to state law concerning this election. 600 signatures are required before an individual may be placed on the

While Mr. Selinsky and Mr. Bec are understandably upset and disappointed as a result of the inaccurate information that they received from someone at the Election

Bureau, they must also share the responsibility for failing to individually research the state laws and consequently, not qualifying for placement on the ballot. The law clearly mandates that 600 signatures are required for placement on the ballot when the total voter population is between 100,000 to 200,000. Either Mr. Selinsky and Mr. Bec did not personally research the state laws concerning elections, or they did not know that the district court, where they wished to sit as judges, served a population of over 100,000 voters rather than 10,000 to 25,000 voters. Regardless, neither mistake nor lack of knowledge is an excuse for failure to follow the law.

As an attorney, I regularly go to court and have the opportunity to

hear individuals attempt to justify their actions by either placing primary blame on others or professing that they did not know the law. However, blaming others and ignorance of the law are not valid excuses for failing to follow the law. Similarly, if potential judicial candidates rely on erroneous information when no ambiguity exists in a law that they could have easily researched for themselves, then they must accept the consequence of their failure to verify such important information. Mr. Selinsky and Mr. Bec are attorneys, and attorneys know it is crucial to validate important information through legal research, rather than merely rely on something that someone tells them. Attorneys are trained to research the law and

realize that reliance upon inaccurate information in the practice of law could result in serious consequences, including malpractice.

How can an elected judge look a citizen in the eye and advise that person that he must apply the law. regardless of the citizen's misunderstanding of a law, when that judge was placed on the ballot contrary to a law that the judge himself misunderstood? How long will it be before a citizen challenges the system and asks a judge to ignore a law, just as a law would be ignored if Mr. Selinsky and Mr. Bec were added to the ballot?



Memorial Day

Patriotism.

The Random House Webster's Dictionary defines the word as "acts that show love, support, and defense of his or her country.

Although they may have not known what the word was, the women and children who put flowers on all the graves of Civil War soldiers in one cemetery in 1866. knew someone must honor all that the men had fought for.

And so it began, from a tiny remembrance to the day Americans now call Memorial Day.

The day itself was called Decoration Day and honored Civil War soldiers until 1971 when Congress expanded the recognition to include all soldiers who died for the country. It was decreed that the holiday would be called Memorial Day and would be celebrated on the fourth Monday in May. (Some states still celebrate the official date that President Lyndon Johnson decided upon in 1966, which was May 30.)

Although we know that women and children decorated graves for the soldiers, the holiday's exact origins are hazy.

In total, 27 cities in the United States claim to have started Decoration Day. These include. Waterloo, N Y. (which President Johnson declared as the offi-cial community which started the holiday); Mobile, Ala.; Montgomery, Ala.; Camden, Ark.; Atlanta, Ga.; Milledgeville, Ga.; New Orleans, La; Columbus, Miss.; Jackson, Miss; Vicksburg, Miss; Raleigh, N.C.; Cincinnati; Charleston, S.C.; Fredericksburg, Va.; Portsmouth, Va.; Richmond, Va.; Warrenton, Va.; Washington, D.C.; Boalsburg, Pa.; and Carbondale, III.

Historians believe the reason the origi-

nal women decorated even possible enemies graves is because the Civil War had more than 620,000 people die for its cause according to the Public Broadcasting web-site. Many of the soldiers had to be

buried in enemy territory, far away from their homes and families who could tend to their plots. General James Garfield spoke at the

30, 1868 at the Arington National Cemetery in Washington, D.C. Today, Memorial Day is observed with parades around the country and flags placed on the sites of the soldiers buried at Arlington. A wreath is also placed on the Tombs of the Unknown.

HOLDING HIS HEAD HIGH

Wearing his Army attire in the Northville Memorial Day parade will be Commander Larry Schwab, head of the VFW Post No. 4012.

Schwab served in Vietnam from 1967 to 1968 in the 11th armed cavalry. He drove a personnel carrier, which he said contrary to popular belief, did have guns

Memorial Day is simple to veterans like Schwab. It is a holiday to honor the men and women who gave their lives for America and for every American's free-

Schwab recalls his days in Vietnam as a learning experience.

"I may have felt as a lot of people do before I went over there. That it isn't important to remember (how lucky Americans are.) But after I went to Vietnam and saw how they lived, I appreciated the United States and our freedom much more. If people in this area could go live over there, even for just a while, they wouldn't take this country for granted," he

Although unexplained, most Americans in the Generation X era or younger and those who have not served in the military tend to forget how freeing our democracy is. That may be the case because asides from the Gulf War, the

U.S. has not seen a major war in almost 20 years. That fact has not gone unnoticed by Schwab.

"Honoring those who served has gone by the wayside. It seems as though people are in their own little world. They don't appreciate or don't care," he said.





Honor the Stars and Stripes

The Star-Spangled Banner, O! Long may it wave, o'er the land of the free and the home of the brave.

It was September 1814. The United States and England were again at war with the idea that the colonies would be invaded and subjugated once more. The plan was that 5,000 British soldiers would set sail southward from Canada through the Hudson Valley. On their way. they stopped in Washington D.C., burned the Capitol building, the White House and ransacked several other public buildings causing President Madison and other officials to flee. After returning to their ships, they continued on to -Baltimore, their next point of attack. They were to join 16 other ships of the mighty British Navy already waiting in Chesapeake Bay to continue the invasion. But first, they needed to destroy the fort at the edge of the water.

Fort McHenry was a low-lying fortification which, even though it was rather small, acted as a forbidding stronghold protecting Baltimore. On its flagpole flew the 15-star American flag.

The attack was launched at 5 a.m. on Sept. 13 and the bombardment continued throughout the day with the fort answering rocket for rocket, gun for gun. As night fell, the British became discouraged at the strong American resistance and decided to land several hundred soldiers to attack the fort from the rear. However, even under the cover of darkness, they were discovered as their small boats attempted to steal past the garrison and, in much confusion, were driven back to the fleet. This so frustrated the naval commanders that they moved their ships closer to the fort and doubled their fire which continued throughout the night.

On the Minden, one of the British ships was a young lawyer from Georgetown named Francis Scott Key. He had boarded the ship as an official envoy, while the fleet was sailing southward from Canada to negotiate with the British admiral as to the release of an intimate friend, an elderly American doctor who was being held prisoner. On the way south, Key witnessed the burning and destruction of the nation's Capitol.

Fearing that he may have overheard their plans to attack Baltimore, it was decided they would detain him until the bombardment and invasion were

Key stood on deck throughout the night watching the battle and on impulse, removed an envelope from his pocket and wrote "And the rocket's red glare, the bombs bursting in

Finally, in the early hours of the morning, the bombardment ceased and there was silence. As day began to break, Key strained his anxious eyes to see through the mist and smoke and haze to see which flag was flying over the fort. Just as the mist was clearing, he caught sight of the flag but because both the stars and stripes and the British union jack are red, white and blue, and because a slight wind began to blow and the banner began to flutter, he wrote "what is that which the breeze ... as it fitfully blows, half concealed, half discloses?" he was not able to determine which flag it was.

At last, in the clear light of day. Key was able to distinguish that it was the American flag and with tear-filled eyes wrote Now it catches the gleam of the morning's first beam ... our flag was still there!

With that dramatic story and the flag being the symbol of our country, I am always amazed at how little respect it is given. With the national patriotic holi-days just around the corner and all the parades and festivities that will be held, let us be thankful for this land we live in and show our respect and give our flag the dignity it deserves.

Let me list for you a few items on flag etiquette which are also a part of the United States Flag

· When our flag is being carried in a parade, everyone should stand as it passes by you the elderly and infirm do not have to rise).

 Both men and women place the right hand over the heart. Men who are wearing hats should remove it with the right hand and hold it on the left shoulder so that the hand is over the heart. Those in uniform salute as the flag passes by.

• During the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag, everyone stands, faces the flag with hand over heart.

· Everyone should rise and remain standing during the playing of our national anthem - "The Star-Spangled Banner." Sing along if you wish, if not, simply stand quietly until it is

• When more than one flag is displayed on a single staff, the U.S. flag should always be displayed at the top. The one exception is when a church flag is flown during services aboard a ship at sea. The U.S. flag may be flown upside down as a distress signal on board a ship.

· All American ships and aircraft sailing and flying beyond our shores carry the American flag. This includes all space crafts and shuttles.

• The flag should be flown at half-staff-until noon on Memorial Day after which it is raised to its peak. It may be flown every day except in inclement weather and only until sunset unless it is illuminated after dark.

• The flag should never touch anything beneath it, such as the ground, the floor, water or merchandise and should be allowed to fly freely without brushing against buildings, trees or other objects. If the flag becomes torn. solled or faded it should not be displayed but destroyed in a dignifled way, either by burial or, preferably, by private burning.

'Up at the Villa'

Sean Penn, Kristin Scott Thomas star in romantic adventure set in Tuscany

"Up at the Villa" is a story of an impulsive sexual encounter which spirals into tragedy, theft, black-mail and eventually, redemptive

· Philip Haas' "Up at the Villa" is set amidst the deceptive beauty of Florence and Tuscany during the rise of Fascism on the eve of World War II.

Although a period piece, it tells the resolutely contemporary story of a woman's journey from innocence to self-knowledge.

While primarily a love story, "Up at the Villa" ingeniously combines elements of the political thriller. the social comedy of manners and the romantic adventure to tell its crisply captivating story. 

Alcohol abuse and prom don't mix

Prom night is an evening filled with images and experiences that can create life-long memories. But for some teens, the consequences of alcohol abuse may cause this memorable night to fade into a blur - or, more tragically, to end up in the headlines of the next day's news.

Serious falls, auto accidents and risky sexual contact are potential concerns when people especially inexperienced teens - overindulge in

"Alcohol is sometimes thought to be a lubricant for social relationships, but it also robs you of judgment or decision-making about just what you will or will not do with your body." says Kenneth Adams Ph.D., professor in the departments of psychiatry and psychology in the University of Michigan Health System.

And, alcohol abuse also can lead to alcohol poisoning - when an individual "massively overloads the body's ability to eliminate alcohol." Adams says. "Deaths from alcohol poisoning are infrequent but not rare."

Some studies indicate that as many as one in five students experiment with alcohol early on in adolescence, says Adams. The problem can increase by the end of the teen years. Among college students, as many as 50 percent regularly over-use alcohol or binge drink. he says. Binge drinking is the consumption of more than four or five drinks on any one occasion.

Furthermore, alcohol abuse in the early years may establish a destructive pattern that will

continue for a lifetime. Teens could be setting themselves up for a lifetime of problems if they choose to drink." says Adams. "All too often, people will say they know their limit or they're in control but it's a self-deception of the highest order." says

What teens do today can affect their cognitive functions later in life, he notes. Short-term memory loss is often the first indicator of alcohol-related neurological damage. This type of memory loss means a person has difficulty remembering new information, therefore, the learning process takes longer.

It also reduces an individual's higher level thinking, the ability to think in abstract terms, says Adams. "Abusive consumption of alcohol changes the underlying brain chemistry and those chemicals control ability and skills. But later in life the damage done to brain chemistry cannot be restored...cannot cure itself. Many problems experienced later in life have direct correlation to when individuals started drink-

There are many reasons why teens begin using alcohol: peer pressure, to feel better, to be part of the crowd, to lift depression, and typical adolescent experimentation. Abuse occurs when an individual consumes more alcohol than the body can eliminate.

'You can eliminate one drink in an hour. there is no way to speed up that process." he says. When people over-consume alcohol what they do is essentially overload their system, he says. "The results are an impairment that only time can eliminate."

Some people are more at risk for alcohol abuse or developing more serious problems with alcohol in later years. One characteristic of a person at risk of developing alcoholism, says Adams, is the sensitization of the nervous system with large consumption of alcohol. A family history of alcoholism and environmental factors should influence a person's decision about

whether to drink.

Some research indicates that at-risk individuals should be counseled to absolutely stay away from even the first episode," he says.

As far as so-called "safe drinking" guidelines, Adams believes those serve only as a "bar that (individuals) can jump over or go under." He recommends that teens do not drink. He says the best way to make this decision is to list all the possible negative outcomes (e.g., death, permanent injury, auto accident, sexual assault, property destruction) as the result of drinking.

Teens should ponder all the undoable consequences that might result before they include alcohol in their prom night plans," he says.



On a typical warm and breezy summer evening. passersby may not even notice Nellie and Eugene Tolot relaxing on the deck of their Howell city home. The secluded backyard retreat of their home at Washington and Isbell streets is pretty much out of sight of those out for an evening stroll.

"Once the trees fill out you can't even see people walking by on the street," Eugene Tolot said.
The couple moved to Howell seven years ago, around

the same time Eugene Tolot retired. He's been busy ever since remodeling and refurbishing the single-family dwelling, which had previously been a duplex. But, come nice weather. Tolot takes his home-improvement projects to the great outdoors.

He has since completed the addition of an adjoining garage and deck, and last summer began constructing a pond in the backyard for water gardening.

That's what Nellie wanted," he said. He began by researching and reading about the

future project on the Internet. The next step?

According to Tolot, the best way to get started is to get a shovel.

"I just started digging a hole." he said. He didn't lay out any design or decide on the size beforehand. He also didn't intend to make the pond quite as large as it turned out to be.

You start digging here, there. You start making a curve here, a curve there," he said. "You need to do a ittle bit more and a little bit more and that's what I ended up with."

The pond nearly covers the center of the Tolots' remaining small backyard.

When you have a small yard and you dig a large hole, what do you do with all that soil?

You get creative. I had no place to put the dirt, so I used it to make a waterfall," he said.

Tolot, a stone mason by trade, has completely covered the pond from its center 3-foot depth right up to its edges with rocks and boulders of all sizes. He estimates he's had about seven tons of rocks and boulders delivered and there are still more to come. He said getting the rocks is the easy part.

You just call up a trucking company and they'll deliver them." he said.



Big bed, small room

Q. Our bedroom is not exactly small, but between the two windows, closet and doors leading to the bath and hall, there's no wall long enough to take our four-poster bed comfortably. What if we back it up to the windows? Will it look awkward because the headboard will cover a lot of the glass?

A. Not if you plan the window dress so it morphs into a kind of canopy framing the head of the bed. Steal a handsome idea from interior designers Anthony Antine and Ho Sang Shin, who screened the windows of a show-house bedroom with flat panels of a sheer lace, edged all around with gros-

The screens lent architectural importance to the windows without blocking the light. Add decora-

tive curtains on either side of the bed, swag the center of the window, and you will have created an architectural background that will support your bed as effectively as any solid wall.

Another thought: Cater-corner the bed and back it with a standing-screen wall. Cater-cornering is also a good way to achieve good feng shui. It lets you angle the bed until it directly faces the chi coming through the bedroom door.

The hardest part is getting them to the backyard, which isn't easily accessible. Some were really tough, he said, but most weren't too bad. The trouble, Tolot said, was "getting through the garage door and making the turn.

Tolot has to take each rock

from the front of the garage where the delivery driver dumps them, lift or roll each into his wheelbarrow, wheel it through the garage. out the walk-in door, around the turn and to the pond. He said he brought most to the back on his own, and then his son. John, helped with the larger ones. A replica of the Manneken Pis statuette, a famous statuette of bronze that sits in the city of Brussels in Belgium and dates back to 1455, sits atop a rather

large rock at one end of Tolot's pond. Tolot himself drilled the hole through the rock that is used as the base to hide the electrical cord that runs the stream of water.

The Tolots said the pond provides them with many hours of enjoyment throughout the warmer months. The rocky edges make the pond extremely attractive to local wildlife, and both Nellie and Eugene Tolot say they enjoy watching the birds and squirrels that come to drink at the water's edge.

Eugene is completing a Canadian slate patio that will encircle the pond and cover the remaining grassy portions of the couple's backyard. The yard itself is surrounded by plantings of shrubs and other leafy bushes that completely block the view from the street in the summer. A black wrought-iron fence completes the design.

Tolot has been working and expanding garden beds in the front yard as well. He recently ordered about 100 daylilles over the Internet and is planting more and more hostas - one of his favorites.

He's looking forward to participating in the second annual LACASA Garden Tour and believes it is for a good cause. LACASA is looking forward to another successful garden tour. Last year's tour generated about \$7,000, which helps the organization provide its programs and services in Livingston County.

Tolot agreed to participate in the tour this year because of comments from some visitors to last year's tour that they

Software helps you design picture-perfect landscape

When snow and bitter cold weather become a distant memory, and the signs of spring loom bright, another campaign is on the horizon for millions of homeowners.

This one involves lawn mowers, weed whackers and fertilizers. It requires at least a few hours a week but, for some, can tie up a large portion of the weekend.

And for others, it requires nothing more than writing a check for the landscapers.

Since 1993, more than 22 million U.S. households have spent more than \$14 billion annually on professional landscape, lawn care and tree care, according to a Gallup Poll.

"When you hire a professional, you're entering into a partnership of sorts," said Tom Devaney, executive vice president of the Professional Lawn Care Association of America. "The role you play in the maintenance of your lawn is key to your lawn's health and performance."

Most lawn care services provide fertilization and weed control, but landscape architects can help homeowners from making costly mistakes.

A landscape designer will know how plants mature, and they are familiar with

Exterior decor brings together home and garden

Interior decorators are turning green thumbs up on a new approach to gardening: call it exterior decorat-

Or call it "curb appeal," a phrase borrowed from real estate agents who've always known that the exterior of a house must be appealing or potential buyers won't bother looking inside.

By any name, we're talking coordination, the kind of symbiosis between home and landscape, the man-made and the natural that was once reserved for grand estates with master gardeners and armies of assistants. Happily, it's a look almost any home gardener can cultivate today, never mind if you're dealing with an acre in the suburbs or a mere window box in the city.

The key is color, according to exterior decorating experts like Ken Charbonneau, executive director of the Institute for Color Research in Chicago, and Larry Bedosky, who manages marketing for Durasol awnings. Just as interior designers

call on color to coordinate indoor decor, they urge home gardeners to create a visual bond outside, between house and garden.

"Think of your house as background, as the 'canvas' on which you'll be building your color scheme," advises Charbonneau, who spent an earlier career in color marketing at the Benjamin Moore paint

As Charbonneau points out, your house is the largest object in your garden, so the paint color you use influences the plant colors you choose. It's a good idea, therefore, to pick a house color that's fairly understated. Any neutral will do, except surprise - good old white.

"White is too strong," Charbonneau explains. "It makes the house too extroverted. Instead of blending in, a white house stands out from the surrounding landscape, yelling, 'Look at how important I am!"

OK, OK, Charbonneau relents, maybe white works on a truly traditional house, something Colonialstyle with clapboards and shutters. But, he warns, never, never paint the foundation of any house solid white:


"Too much contrast with the foundation plantings," he says. "They'll look spindly, and the house itself will look insecure, as if it's falling over."

By contrast, darker colors "root" a house - and its adjacent evergreens visually locking them into the ground. Ditto for the neutral colors Charbonneau favors for siding: anything in the family of browns, from beiges to tans to taupe, or the range of greens, from sage to khaki.

Yellow is the newest neutral on the horizon, says the color expert. "But not true yellow - true yellow goes greenish in summer and can be an eyesore on a snow-covered winter landscape. We're talking golden neutrals like butterscotch and camel's

A special tip from the color pro: any color will look stronger and brighter in daylight and sunshine on a big area like the side of a house than it did when you picked it out in the paint store. To play safe, go for exterior colors that are "more toned, muted and grayed" than you'd choose for an interior room, where they're







for an interior room, where they're seen under gentler lighting conditions.

The same principle applies to colors on trim and shutters: "Softer contrast is in." says Charbonneau. Passe are the days of dramatic black shutters against a palebodied house. Gentle tone-on-tone is today's look. The idea is to make the house itself settle quietly into the background, he says, so the garden becomes the star.

Stardom starts at the front door. Paint it a dominant color you pick fresh from the garden. Here are a trio of examples from Charbonneau's palette of ideas:

- 1. Gray house with crisp white trim gets a tulip yellow front door, inspired by a predominantly yellow garden.
- 2. Taupe house with creamy off-white trim gets a rich teal front door, playing back to a multicolor garden.
- 3. Weathered-gray house with bright white trim gets an azalea-red front door in counterpoint to a mostly red-pink garden.

Plan your plantings so the color theme repeats throughout the season, Charbonneau counsels. For example, let spring's

azaleas morph into summer's red geraniums, which then give way to the brilliant reds of autumn's leaves on, say, a pair of prized Japanese maples.

Even the winter landscape can play a part in the passing color parade when

you plant with an eye to berries and barks, Charbonneau says.

Options also vary with the territory. If you live in the Sun Belt, for example, he suggests that you bring your house hue "a couple of octaves up" to compensate for the color-flattening effect of

intense sunlight. In the deep woods, go more mellow, the better to blend into the background a la Frank Lloyd Wright.

Wherever you may live, think indigenous: go for flora that grows naturally in your area, including decorative grasses, "a big, beautiful trend in gardens everywhere

today ... and they go with hearly every color," Charbonneau says.

Another "new" trend in exterior decorating has actually been around for several centuries: outdoor awnings. De rigueur in the days before air conditioning,

> awnings have come back on a double wave of fashion - the popularity of Victorian-style decorating and our love of outdoor living.

Awnings are another colorful ingredient in exterior decorating. Some advice from Larry Bedosky of Durasol, a major

manufacturer of awnings of all stripes: "Choose an awning style that works with both the architecture of your house and with its landscaping," Bedosky suggests.

"Use the colors from your garden to guide your choice of awning fabrics there are plenty of stripes with blended

colors. On the other hand, a solid-color awning can offer a subtle accent without drawing too much attention away from the landscape," he says.

Coolest of all, Bedosky points out, "an awning increases your home's overall square footage, extending your living space beyond the structural walls."

Charbonneau adds a final idea for taking exterior decorating to the max - plant an all-white garden.

"White and green are Mother Nature's great neutrals," he observes. "White lets you get away with mixing the most outrageous colors, in a garden, in a bouquet, in a room."

White offers another plus for any garden enthusiast: "It's the last color you see after dark," Charbonneau says, "So you can sit outside and enjoy your garden well into the night."



Valuable tips for the novice gardener

If you're all thumbs in the garden - and none of them green - don't despair. Cultivating garden savvy takes a lot of practice, a bit of trial and error and all the helpful hints you can get. Here are a few tips to get you started.

If you're buying flowers or vegetable

transplants, try to avoid plants with fully developed flowers.

Look for plants with tighter buds that aren't open yet.

Bigger isn't always better. Smaller plants with very little flowers or fruit on them often are healthier and suffer little transplant shock.

Inspect roots to make sure they're


healthy; if the nursery salespeople don't like this then you should take your business elsewhere.

As soon as you get your plants home, start planting and, during the first few critical weeks, always remember to water them regularly.

The key to staking plants is to start early before they are too large. Keep the stake

from showing by using natural twigs or green stakes with twine.

Using plenty of mulch is one of the best ways to make your garden healthier and less time-consuming. A nice layer of wood chips, pine straw or shredded leaves suppresses weeds, stabilizes soil temperatures and conserves water. (CNS)









Fragrant lavender is an ancient herb with many uses

Not many plants give back to gardeners as much as lavender.

The uses of lavender are limited only by your imagination. This easy-to-grow plant is said to be uplifting to the mind and spirit, adds beauty to any garden and imparts a fresh twist to kitchen and bath recipes.

Prized since ancient times for its medicinal purposes, lavender is thought by herbalists to help relieve insomnia, headaches and dizziness and act as an anti-bacterial agent. It is also believed to be one of the ingredients used by ancient Egyptians in the mummification process.

Sheryl and Marshall Lozier, owners of Summers Past Farms in Flinn Springs, Calif., have a field of lavender that is reminiscent of those in the Provence region of southern France. There, lavender is a crop grown for its prized oil.

The Loziers' field is smaller than the vast fields in France, but no less beautiful.

"The reason we love to grow lavender is because it's so pretty," Sheryl said.

Lavender is a drought-tolerant plant that doesn't like wet feet, so it requires a well-

drained soil. It needs little or no fertilizer and some varieties bloom almost continually. Lavender is a fast grower that does best when it gets at least four hours of direct sunlight a day.

The Loziers recommend subtle shaping, rather than drastic pruning after your crop has been harvested.

"You don't want to cut back deep,"
Sheryl said. Plants should be pruned back to about the second leaf of foliage, but not into the woody center.

Lavender flowers and foliage blend beautifully with bedding plants, adding height and color. And, whenever lavender is blooming, it attracts beneficial, bees to the garden.

This woody shrub ranges in height from 1 to 5 feet, can be planted as a border, allowed to grow into shrubs or, where space is limited, can grow in containers on a sunny patio. If you do plant lavender in a pot, choose a type that is breathable, like terra cotta, and use a light, well-drained soil.

Popular companions to lavender in the garden are other plants that can be used in the kitchen, such as rosemary, artichoke and mint.

At Summers Past Farms, lavender grows alongside a bay laurel tree and near

an arbor covered by a grapevine. Clary sage, anemone and honeysuckle are native companions to lavender. Roses have always been a popular combination, too, since their petals can be harvested and combined with lavender to make a beautiful and fragrant potpourri.

POPULAR PICKS.

There are at least 15 species of lavender and many more varieties. Lavender doesn't come only in its namesake color, but in a palette ranging from white to rose and in every shade of blue and purple imaginable, from a soft pastel to brilliant cobalt. The foliage varies greatly in color, too, from a dusty gray to a bright chartreuse.

Some of the most popular varieties are Spanish lavender (Lavandula stoechas,) a stocky plant with dense, short spikes, which blooms in spring and summer; French lavender (L. dentata,) which has short, spiky clusters and is almost always in bloom; and Dutch or spike lavender (L. latifolia,) which produces vibrant blue flowers all summer.

English lavender (L. angustifolia,) is the most popular type of all because it tends to be the most aromatic. The best-known are the Hidcote and Munstead varieties.

Munstead, a dwarf English variety, doesn't get much more than a foot tall and is often used as a border plant. English lavenders bloom from spring to fall.


The Loziers planted 18 varieties of lavender and are finding that some thrive, sending out lovely spikes of brilliant flowers, while others look like puny seedlings barely clinging to life. In their garden, neither the Hidcotes nor the Munsteads are doing well.

Among the best performers in their field are the long-stemmed Grosso, an English lavender type; Provence, a brilliant blue that makes the finest potpourri; and Goodwin Creek, which is noted for its airy, fernlike foliage more than for its compact flower heads.

Lavender does best when propagated vegetatively, rather than from seed, but a 1994 introduction, Lavender Lady, has received good reviews from gardeners who have started it from seed.

At Summer's Past, lavender is propagated and cuttings are tenderly cared for by the guru of the greenhouse, Patricia Lozier, who has lived on the property for 46 years.

Prices climb but buyers still have wide variety of options

It seems that anywhere you drive in southeastern Michigan you will find new construction. Our downtowns are being renewed. We're building in the country. With the advent of Interstate 696, residents in the suburbs found opportunities to live in a rural setting within an hour of where they work.

This has been the story of Livingston County for the past 10 years. Because of the building boom, home prices have literally gone through the roof. But homebuyers still have a large selection to choose from. The following is a snap-shot of what buyers can find in Livingston County.

Marhofer/Campbell Building Company

Ranging in prices from \$178,900 to \$216,900, Marhofer/Campbell is currently building homes in the Honey Creek Meadows subdivision. Located just south of M-36 on Dexter-Pinckney Road, the sub is right across the street from the new Pinckney Community High School. Honey Creek is one of the first subdivisions in the area complete with sidewalks.

"We are finding that people want to mingle with their neighbors again," said Jack Campbell. "People want front porches with the swing, and want to be able to walk down sidewalks instead of streets."

Since they have the curb gutter, there are no familiar ditches in front of the homes as seen in other subs.

Homes like the Paige, a Cape Cod-style home, have the familiar front porch. Including the Paige, Marhofer/Campbell offers six different floor plans, "but we are not locked in to them," Campbell stated.

They also build custom homes for people. Their lowest price home is the Elizabeth model. It has 3 bedrooms and 2.5 baths, comes complete with a great room with fireplace, first floor laundry next to the kitchen, and a master suite with cathedral ceiling, private bath and shower.

Scott Visger, managing partner at Vantage, believes that "when you have a great company that makes a great product, the sales are easy." Vantage builds 14 to 16 custom homes per year, and currently has a number of homes within Winans Woods on Chilson Road in

Pinckney. Nestled among hills and forest, Winans Woods is adjacent to a 5,000-acre state park. Vantage is building homes in Moon Shadows, Pinecreek Ridge and Oakpoint. Typically, their homes range from low \$300,000s to \$700,000.

"I don't want to build any more homes per year than we do right now," Visger confessed. "I like the close touch that we have with people."

Visger works with people on the block planning of their new home. After they talk about the basic layout of the home, they go into design development where they can visualize what their home will look like through computer-aided designs. They can also take a virtual walk-through their new home to see what it

"We give them up-front budgeting so they know what the expectations are and what features they can choose. I never want to surprise people," said Visger. "Sometimes they will come in with an idea the they saw in a maga-

That poses a problem because designers out of state who are not involved in the actual building of the home aren't concerned too much with price; they just want to design a

great looking house. Visger can then show them how a couple changes to the design of the home can reduce costs.

"Because I am involved right from the start," Visger said, "I can help them draw up a great design but also show them how to cut some costs."

Paterra Homes

Anthony Paterra's great-grandfather was a mason. His grandfather was a mason. His father continued that tradition and taught the trade to him. So there is a reason why every home Paterra builds is brick.

path of light from one end of the house to another. You can put your system on vacation mode, which memorizes your normal pattern of lighting usage while you are gone. Touching another button will illuminate every light in the house and outside whenever necessary.

Camera

"Wherever you have the Cat5 outlet," Kamenec continued, "you can plug a camera into the room, allowing you to monitor your baby as she sleeps. When she is older, that same outlet serves as a television and phone line."

The Wings have tied the game late in the third period and your doorbell rings. Do you get up to see who it is, or do you turn the channel for a second to see who is at the door? Whether you are in your home office or in front of the television, you can verify who is at the door without leaving your desk chair or recliner. Through a pre-selected closed circuit TV channel, you can see whether it's a door-todoor salesman or your neighbor.

What happens when you go on vacation and can't have someone look in on your home? Just like the technology that is being used today in some childcare centers, you will be able to look in on your home using the Internet.

Action

Whether the action taken is work or play, this integrated system will allow you to work and play more conveniently.

You now have the ability to have your home just as networked as your office. Just because each of your children has a computer and you have one in your home office doesn't mean you have to buy that many printers. You can share a common printer, a high-speed Internet line, or challenge your son to a video game from two different rooms.

Say you want to move the party into the finished basement but don't want to lug the whole sound system downstairs. Just bring the speakers. With the same outlet, all you have to do is plug the speakers in and you're good to go. And

since you have the ability to send video signals to any room in the house, you can watch your movie from your basement or bedroom just as easily as the family room from which the VCR is located in.

Security

Security systems have been out for years. However, have you ever had the ability to know when your son gets home from school? Your home can call you at work to let you know which child got home, giving you added peace of mind. You will also be able to see how they are doing from work by just logging online.

Convenience

Controlling the temperature of your home is nothing new. But now you can control it from your telephone or computer. What if you were going away for a week's vacation skiing at Boyne? You don't want your home at the same temperature as usual, but you also don't want to come back to a cold house. Set your system to heat your home at 50 degrees during the week, and then bring it up again to 70 the day you arrive home.

Got Milk?

If you are running low, your refrigerator will contact the local grocer to deliver the groceries you are running low on. And back to the meat loaf. Is your recipe box as disorganized as mine? Now you can keep your recipes on the computer, and then program your oven settings from there. Hit enter, and presto, perfect meat

Bottom Line

Whether you can afford all of the technology available today is not the issue. Companies like ElTech offer different packages for various budgets. While this is still an option for homebuyers building a new home, it will someday be standard.

Water Skiing and Wake **Boarding Tips for Beginners**

Starting Position

- Secure bindings to feet, get in the water and wrap arms around knees in a compact "cannon ball" tuck. Lock elbows at sides. Tips of skis or wakeboard should be 10 in. above water in a vertical position.
- Grab onto rope, have the driver idle slowly for a few feet and yell "Hit-it" when you are ready. Resist the urge to pull up, let the boat do the work for you.
- Skiing Position Be patient! After 3-5 seconds, you'll be planing on the water.
- Slowly rise to a sitting position using leg strength while keeping elbows semi-locked. Pulling yourself up with your arms will cause your skis to shoot out from under you causing you to fall backwards.
- Use knees as shock absorbers to soak up bumpy water and lean in the direction you want to ski.

The driver is responsible for the safety of the skier/wakeboarder. Many states require an Official Observer to be onboard also. It is important that you know the standard safety hand signals before going out to ski.

Planting Clematis

Clematis is a flowering and climbing vine. Follow these planting tips to ensure its vigorous growth. Till plenty of compost or manure into the soil to a depth of 12. Clematis grows best in rich, alkaline soil that drains well. Dig a hole deep enough so that the plant is 2 deeper in the ground than the container it came in. Plant away from brick or concrete walls that are exposed to the sun and reflect heat. The roots must be kept as cool as exposed to the sun and reflect heat. The roots must be kept as cool as possible. After planting, surround with mulch to help keep soil moist and to protect the roots from heat. Prune your Clematis to the lowest pair of healthy buds. After its second year, prune the plant back to 2' off the ground. the ground.



Finishing Touches



How to lay pavers and stepping stones

Stake out an area with a string line 4" wider than the project area. Excavate to a depth of 4" for pavers or 3" for patio stones. This will allow for a 1" sand base to make leveling of stones easier. Level and compact your base before adding sand.

Spread and level a 1" to 2" sand base over the entire project area. Tip. to level the sand, use two lengths of 3/4" : diameter PVC pipes laid parallel 4' - 6' apart from each other and drag a 2' x 4' board across pipes, leveling the sand and moving your pipes as you progress over your project area.



How to Plant Shrubs

Dig the hole in a newly prepared planting bed, large enough to accomodate the rootball.

Remove the plant from the pot by turning it over and tapping lightly on the bottom. The plant should slip out easily.

Set the plant in the hole so that the top of the rootball is level with the surrounding soil. Fill in with the remaining soil, eliminating air pockets.

Build a temporary water basin around the plant to allow easy and consistent watering the first few months.

Water thoroughly.

Apply a 3" layer of organic mulch around your new plants to help conserve moisture, discourage weeds and regulate soil temperature.
