Science teacher Mitch Van Ochten is having a pretty good week. Not only is he a published author but he was also named Metropolitan Detroit Science Teachers Association Outstand-

ing Educator of the Year. Van Ochten, eighth grade scince and history teacher at Cooke Middle School, was chosen from a possible 1200 teachers in the area. The committee bases its decision on a teachers classroom practices, professional development, and professional leader-

The award came as a surprise to Van Ochten because of his limited number of years teaching, he

Group protests bike path development

More than 100 Northville Township residents jammed township hall to protest something that isn't likely to happen for years, if at all. officials said.

The residents, many who live on Winchester Drive, were concerned about the possibility of a bike path or sidewalk being constructed on their street and made their voices heard to the township planning commission at its regular

The crowd broke out into applause several times and one resident was ruled out of order

by Richard Allen, vice chairman of the planning commission, when she urged those opposed to a bike path or sidewalk to stand up.

The reactions were despite Allen's comments in the beginning of the meeting that bike path or sidewalk construction is a long way off for Winchester Drive.

When we put the township's (recreation) master plan together, the number one thing people surveyed wanted was bike and walking paths," he said. "But as far as putting anything on Winchester Drive there are absolutely no plans at this time.

The uproar followed a story in the May 18

issue of the Northville Record that printed a map of existing bike paths, paths soon to be constructed and proposed bike paths. The map was part of a story about the bike path soon to be construction along Six Mile Road between Northville Road and Haggerty Road. It indicated a proposed bike path between Seven Mile Road and Five Mile Road along Winchester.

Allen said the most likely bike path would be one alongside the road on the side of the street with fire hydrants and not an eight-foot path

Northville eatery plans opening sometime in June

A Northville restaurant that planned to open last summer should open sometime in June. the owner said.

Essence Restaurant, 146 Main Centre, plans to open its doors by the end of June.

"As long as everything stays on schedule." said Wayne Holman. owner of the restaurant. Holman said he didn't want to comment further on the situation until the date of the restaurant opening was definite.

The announcement comes five weeks after Holman said the restaurant would open within four weeks. Any opening is a welcome one after the former business at the location. Northville Athletic Club, closed more than two years

Holman and a partner told the Northville Récord last May they planned to open last summer. however, that was before a series

of problems held up the opening. For example, problems between

the two partners caused a delay.

"I've been told the partnership between the owners is still struggling, said Lori Ward, Northville Downtown Development Authority director, at an April 11 meeting. And I've been told the chances of the restaurant opening soon are slim."

Holman said the problems have been worked out, however he did not want to comment on the solu-

Another problem the restaurant owners encountered was a transfer of the liquor license to Essence restaurant. The restaurant received its license in March.

More than \$200,000 has been spent remodeling the restaurant from its previous look.





Wangler takes second shot at OCC trustee position

On June 12, Oakland voters will

elect two people, from a field of six, to the Board of Trustees at Oakland Community College, which has about 24,000 students at five campuses. This is the first in a series of brief profiles on the candidates and their respective positions.

Four years ago, Bingham Farms resident John A. Wangler came within 130 votes of winning a spot on the Oakland Community College Board of Trustees.

In a hotly contested race for two seats on the board, Wangler was initially declared a winner. After a counting error was detected, he was informed he had lost.

The experience didn't leave Wan-

gler bitter. It lest him determined.

"This time I'm better organized," he said last week, as he talked about being one of six candidates vying for two seats on the board of

Wangler, 72, said his experience as an educator, coupled with extensive community involvement. gives him a unique perspective to bring to the board. He taught psychology and philosophy at OCC for 24 years before retiring in 1992. Prior to that, he was an associate dean at the University of Detroit and a teacher and director of adult education in the Berkley School

He's on the board of directors at the Fox Manor Nursing Center and he's active at Shrine High School in Royal Oak where he's on the board of education and a member of the

Dad's Club.

While at OCC, Wangler was also active in OCCFA (Oakland Community College Faculty Association) and helped draft the first Faculty Master Agreement in 1968.

Wangler still teaches psychology on a part-time basis. His wife Theresa, a nurse, teaches medical classes as well as psychology.

Wangler said his direct and indirect involvement at OCC helps him understand day-to-day operations at the college. It has also convinced him change is needed on the

The current board lacks cohesion, Wangler insisted, and there is a morale problem within the ranks of some managers and administra-

Morale is important, he said. because people perform better when they feel like they are part of the team.

Asked to elaborate. Wangler declined.

"I'm running a positive cam-paign." he said, "but there's desinitely a need for change."

For one thing. Wangler said he'd like assurances that taxpayers are getting the most for tax dollars and that students are getting the most for their tuition.

"I'm prepared to campaign on behalf of the millage renewal," he said, referring to the election in

June. 2001, when voters will be asked to renew the millage that provides 18 percent of the OCC operating budget, \$116 million.

"But before I ask voters to approve it," Wangler continued, "I want to make sure we're getting the most out of what we have."

Wangler said he's fascinated with continuing development in education, such as the growing trend toward so-called "distance learning," the name given to courses taught or augmented with television, the Internet, or other technological advances.

Distance learning provides great opportunities," Wangler said. "But it's not for everybody. It's no panacea.*

Wangler is not particularly disturbed by the drop in enrollment at

Since the fall of 1991, when nearly 30,000 students attended one or more of the five campuses. enrollment has fallen to about

24,000. We've experienced prosperous times," he said, "and history shows

that fewer people enroll in classes when times are good. Wangler said his major concern

is delivering the best possible education. Enrollment will take care of itself, he said.

The Wanglers have three grown children; John, Marian and Dan, and eight (soon to be 10) grandchildren.

Other candidates are incumbents, Carol L. Crew and Pamala Davis, and challengers Richard J. Akehurst, Athena Dumas-Lawrence, and Marjorie Nanian

Victorian Ball out, new dance to debut

A 12-year tradition in the city of Northville has been done away with because not enough people were having a ball at the event.

The Victorian Ball, traditionally the Saturday of the city of Northville's Victorian Festival in early September, is being replaced with a Victorian country dance due to low attendance in the past.

The change takes effect with this year's festival. The dance will be Sept. 16.

That does not mean a country western dance where people will be allowed to wear cowboy boots," said Laurie Marrs, director of the Northville Chamber of Commerce. "It means like in Little House on the Prairie when they would all gather in the barn

The Northville Chamber of Commerce coordinates the Victorian event.

Marrs said attendees of the dance will be encouraged to wear the kind of clothing people from the Victorian era would be likely to wear during the day.

"Attendees of the dance still should wear Victorian clothes," Marrs said. The dance will be complete with a "caller" for square dancing. Marrs said. However, many details still need to be worked out, she said.

Northville Mayor Christopher Johnson said the Victorian Festival, including the dance, is a

worthwhile event. "The festival has been a real good thing for the city." Johnson said. "It helps bring together the people in the community and people in from outside the com-

Johnson said he and his wife are two of probably four people in the community who can make the claim of attending every Victorian Ball. He said the change will freshen up the dance.

"I don't know if it (the change) is necessarily needed," he said. *But it makes it a little fresher. It's not uncommon for an organization to alternate annual

Marrs said the ball is being replaced with the dance mostly due to sagging attendance. Last year, just 90 people went to the

"The number of attendees has been decreasing on an annual basis so we wanted to revisit the ball this year and look at different ways to improve it." she

Several of the details still need to be worked out, including price of admission.

There are many details that haven't been ironed out and we embrace anyone interested in serving on the dance committee," Marrs said.







Issues at a Glance

Candidates for the Northville School Board race are already preparing for some of the tough issues two of them will face next year.

Incumbent Joan Wadsworth, Treasurer of the school board, Judy Wollack, Ken Roth, and Carol Poenisch are running for the two available seats on the board this year. The election will be held June 12.

Wadsworth is the only one of the two whose terms are up this year seeking reelection. President Mike Poterala will not run again.

The candidates agreed to discuss issues such as overcrowding in schools, weighted grades, technology and the special ed waiver with the Northville Record.

High School Health Education Class

The district created a mandatory Health Curriculum with a sex ed portion in the course. Some parents want this class to be an elective charging they should have a right to choose how their children learn this information. However, some believe the children who need the information the most would not get it if the class were an elective.

Current position

The School Board referred the issue to the Citizens Health Advisory Committee for further review. They also approved an extension of the CHAC's deadline and took the Health component out of next year's requirements.

There should be two classes offered one with sex ed and one without. This would eliminate the need to remove a student from the class as well as allowing those who want the information to have access

She would also like to see doctors brought in for portions of the class.

The class should not be mandatory. Parents should be able to make the choice how their children get this information. The parents also should have been given more information from the start and have more say in the process of developing curriculum.

The information in the Healt Curriculum, including sex educatio needs to be available to high school students. A variety of option and/or classes need to be devel oped to meet the needs and issue of all parents.

Overcrowding in schools

The Future Facilities Use Committee released a report earlier this year stating the district's elementary schools would reach capacity by next year. This issue had some parents concerned the class sizes would continue to increase, some suggesting the district build a new school. However, the committee's report shows a decline in enrollment beginning in the 2004 school year.

The School Board referred the issue and findings of the Future Facilities Use Committee to another recommending body which will be formed later this summer. They will determine the long term solution for the problem of over crowding. The board, however, has final approval.

The district is not ready for I another new school. We need to be patient and see what happens and determine at a later date whether enough children are moving into the district to warrant such a move. However, I am a little disappointed : in the size of some of the classes but the district has done a good job moving the kids around.

If enrollment trends begin to i decrease I would not be for a new school in the district as long as the student/teacher ratio is acceptable to parents. I would be for correcting the problem through other means.

The issue needs further consider- : ation. The board needs to investigate its options carefully and wait for the new committees findings. However, if the district does need a new school, I believe the community . would support this, if the district's research is solid.

Special Education Waiver

Reduces the number of days in the special education summer program by 15 days. The schedule allows for two non-consecutive weeks of break during the summer. Some parents feel this disruption in schedule and the slow process by which it was approved have caused set backs in their children's progress. However, Some other parents and members of the district feel the shortened schedule allows teachers more planning time and is beneficial in the long run.

The school board approved the waiver for summer of 2000. However, they said they may reconsider asking for the waiver for the summer of 2001 unless they have assurances from the State it will be approved or not approved in a timely matter.

I would like to see more information before making a judgment on this issue.

It would seem we are working with small enough numbers that we could find a solution that disrupted the students as little as possible. To me, it would seem logistically correct if the teachers could still have adequate planning time with a four day week, for example, as opposed to two (non-consecutive) weeks off , during the summer.

The district needs to explain why it can be appropriate to ask for waivers from the state. That part of the discussion has been missing. I not given in a timely fashion. Par Also, if the district contemplates waivers, there must be a clear understanding with the state regarding the timing of approval or denial. If they don't have that understanding then the district needs a fall back plan.

Technology

Northville parents have recently debated the importance and use of computers and other new technology in schools.

The School Board recently approved the purchase of 266 new computers for the high school. They also approved a Computer Aided Design course in the Middle and High schools as just a few examples of their commitment to technology education.

Any student graduating today needs to know his or her way around a computer in order to function in college and in the work, world. Computers need to be seen as an academic tool the administra-

Computers should be more accessible to students but should not be used as a substitute teacher. Rather, they should be something students learn how to use as a research and reference tool.

Technology is a tool which can support and enhance learning. We need to work hard to continue to identify the best uses of technology in the classroom.

It is very important all students a all levels receive technology classe and have access to computers i their classrooms. The district need to continue to improve this curricu lum, providing the skills, informatio and education best benefiting ou

Weighted grades

The High School Improvement Committee recently voted down the weighting of grades at the high school level. This means students in Advanced Placement classes will not receive extra points for the grades they receive in these classes.

The School Board asked the High School Improvement Committee to reexamine the issue and give the board the rationale behind the decision as well as the criteria they used to judge the issue. They also asked them to consider some alternatives to weighted grades.

teaching diversity to the high school health class to what candidates would do with a \$250,000 district budget surplus.

"I wish it was a bigger number to work with." Wadsworth said.

The candidates came up with several ideas for such a surplus. including Wollack and Poenisch who advocated giving it to the teachers for their hard work in the district. Poenisch added maybe some could even be given to bus drivers who seem to be a forgotten link in the chain.

Wadsworth said it should be used for inhovative grants and Roth wanted to see a drug task

force implemented in the district. Roth came out strong against drugs and school safety. He said as a former prosecuting attorney and the head of a drug task force, he has seen the detrimental effects drugs have on young people. He said he is an advocate for the D.A.R.E. program as well as having a police presence in the

Wollack agreed, saying children need to know they have options other than violence and how to handle those situations. As a social worker for delinquent boys in downtown Detroit Wollack said the worst thing the district can do is not acknowledge the problem. She said they should teach students what to do if there is an incident in school and how to get out

Additionally, parents asked the candidates where they stood on the voucher issue. Vouchers would allow students in falling school districts to get government funds

to go to a private school. All of the candidates opposed the voucher system including Carol Poenisch who has strong lies with the Michigan legislature. She

said she is opposed to public funds being used for private schools.

The vouchers are not a guarantee that students will be getting a better education," she said. "Private schools will have the right to turn students away even if they have a voucher. Also, it is taking money away from public school kids all over the state.

Poenisch said she has lobbied congress several times and is very familiar with per pupil counts, proposal A, as well as the voucher issue.

Overall, those who came to hear the candidates speak said they were pleased with their responses and had a difficult decision ahead







Several Northville Township firefighters worked a 24-hour shift May 22, but it wasn't due to an excessive amount of fire runs that

It was the first day of round-theclock service provided by the department.

The Northville Township board of trustées approved the changes May 18 and they went into effect the following Monday after the public safety department studied the possible change for about two years. The change means full-time firefighters always will be at the township's No. 2 station as opposed to relying on volunteer responders at off hours.

Chip Snider, director of public safety in Northville Township, said the change was easily justified by the increased demands on the department.

Ten years ago, there just wasn't the demand for our services that we have now," Snider said. "But our runs already are up 28 percent for this year compared to last year and I expect that trend to continue for the next five years before it might start to plateau."

In 1994, the township fire department made 775 runs and in 1999 made more than 2,100.

Many of the runs depended on paid on-call, or volunteer, firefighters who would be required to respond from their residence to the station and then to the emer-

With 24-hour service, three fulltime firefighters will always be at the station. They will work one 24hour shift and then have two days off. The department's Seven Mile station is equipped with a full-size kitchen and sleeping facilities.

The change will improve response times and resident safe-

Chief Bill Zhmendak, Northville Township fire department, said the department services will have little change helps cut back on liability effect on it financially. issues for civilians responding to

"We were able to implement this change without a request for more money," he said. "In fact, we'll probably have a slight reduction in the overtime we pay."

The department did hire an additional full-time firefighter to bring the number of full-timers up to nine.

The change has won the blessing of the firefighters' union.

Chris Madzik, siresighter and vice president secretary of the International Association of Fire-

Snider said the expansion of fighters, Northville Township Local 3961, said the union supports the change.

The union is very excited we're moving in this type of direction and we're very happy the department and union are doing this in a cooperative effort," he said.

Additionally, he said, services provided by the department will be a bit more efficient.

This is a good thing because now we're guaranteed a response 24 hours a day, 365 days a year." he said.

Zhmendak said the move to 24hour service is a "major step."

This is the first time in the history of the department we'll have somebody available 24 hours a day, seven days a week, including

holidays," he said. The move to 24-hour service was one considered by the department



Tax break possible for potential OIS building buyer

Township officials are considering a huge tax break for a company looking to possibly move to the area and bring more than 500 jobs and \$40 million in capital investments.

The Michigan Economic Development Corp. requested the Northville Township Board of Trustees consider a tax abatement on the initial personal property investment for Floridabased Nanovation Technologies. The company is considering moving into the building formerly occupied by Optical Imaging Systems Inc., 47050 Five Mile Road. An abatement, which taxes personal property on half of its true cash value, could be worth more

than \$500,000.

Dawn Baetsen, managing director global business development for the Michigan Economic Development Corp., said Michigan is competing with cities in North Carolina and Texas.

"They are very willing to come and are pleased with the state of Michigan," she said. "I don't want them to consider coming if we can't give them a fair deal."

Nanovation designs, develops, and manufactures integrated optic devices. Products made include switches, splitters, couples, waveguides, and filters. The company was established as U.S. Integrated Optics in 1996 and in 1998, the name was changed to Nanovation Technologies.

According to a memo to the

township board from the state organization. "the facility would be used to complete the development phase and manufacture and distribute integrated optical components. Over the five-year horizon, we would employ in excess of 500 people with an average hourly wage greater than \$21 per hour. The anticipated capital investment would be in excess of \$40 million."

Baetsen said the company is drawn to the area because of a solid labor force and the building was used for a similar purpose when Optical Imaging Systems ran part of its operations there.

Dick Henningsen, Northville Township supervisor, said the board "may have a sour taste in its mouth" after granting Optical Imaging Systems a tax abatement and it closed the Northville location shortly after it opened.

"I want to hear what a company representative has to say before I make up my mind." Henningsen said. "I'm still on the fence but my personal background on the issue tells me no."

Henningsen said he doesn't want to set a trend of granting

tax abatements out of fairness to other businesses.

The initial investment would have to be large due to the amount of work to get the build-

ing back in shape, Baetsen said.

The building would require a large investment to get back to operating standards because the insides have been "gutted" of basic materials, such as ventilation unit parts, walls and materials from the "clean room." Hen-

ningsen said the board of trustees will mull the abatement and make a decision in June or

July.


But Gov. John Engler said he is pulling to get the company into Michigan.

Also, he said, the current focus is to build bike paths and sidewalks along the mile roads and major roads like Sheldon Road and Beck Road, where new developers are building and are required by ordinance to build the pathways along their develop-

Additionally, he said, the Six Mile Road bike path is one that's been in the works for 15 years. with the last six being spent determining funding and planning.







Lansing seeks to provide oasis from consumer fraud

Slamming, cramming, credit reporting problems, medical billing fraud and nursing home care are among the concerns most on the minds of consumers, according to the findings of the House Republican Task Force on Consumer

But the biggest frustration for consumers, said state Reps. Laura Toy, R-Livonia, and Mark Jansen. R-Grand Rapids, is that when they have a problem they often do not know whom to call.

In fact, many of the phone calls lawmakers receive in their Lansing offices from constituents turn out to be, not government related, but consumer complaints.

To address that, the representatives are proposing to create a "universal complaint hotline." Not only would staffers operating the toll-free number provide a referral service for complaining consumers - directing the callers not only to the correct level of government. federal, state or local, but to the specific department - and would compile lists of the calls it gets to keep lawmakers informed about what kinds of consumer complaints are on the minds of con-

Toy and Jansen are also asking that lawmakers begin to receive quarterly reports about consumer complaints from the various state departments that typically handle them: the Attorney General. Consumer and Industry Services, the Department of Environmental Quality, the Family Independence Agency, the Department of Transportation, and others. The purpose is to keep elected officials "privy to the most common consumer complaints and help develop legislative solutions to those problems.

Those proposals were among a list unveiled Monday, April 24, by Toy and Jansen at a press conference in Livonia. They were contained in a report issued by the task force as a result of hearings held around the state last summer. Members of the task force including Reps. Toy. Randy Richardville, R-Monroe, Steve Vear, R-Hillsdale, Clark Bisbee, R-Jackson, Charles LaSata, R-St. Joseph, and Jason Allen, Traverse City - conducted six hearings across the state from Monroe to Traverse City which drew, on average, crowds of 25 attendees.

This is the 32nd task force report to be issued by the House Republican Policy Committee. chaired by Jansen, since its formation in 1987. Toy said task force efforts are intended to keep the lawmakers in touch with their constituents. Past task force reports have generated many new

state laws. in the hearings, lawmakers identified three areas of consumer concern that they can address in legislation — telephone slamming and cramming, nursing home care and medical billing practices.

Slamming is already illegal Michigan under law passing in 1998, but it remains the number one source of complaints from state residents to the Federal Communications Commission. Some 2.800 slamming complaints were filed in 1998 to the Michigan Public Service Commission.

Phone companies are supposed to receive a "letter of authority" or verify the customer's request through a third party before switching long distance services. but "there are many ways in which unscrupulous companies prey on unknowing consumers and use deceptive measures to obtain service, according to the task force

*For instance, there are phone companies named: Hold, I Don't Care, I Don't Know. During a typical phone solicitation, the caller (representing the company Hold) may ask in the middle of the call. 'Can I put you on Hold?' An answer in the affirmative results in the switching of the consumer's telephone carrier.

Likewise, according to Toy, cramming is also illegal. That is ber or address where the company the practice of adding charges to a consumer's phone bill that the consumer did not ask for. But it still a source of many com-

plaints. To address these concerns, the task force is recommending a number of changes in law, includ-

• Legislation requiring "truth in billing." This legislation would require any company adding a charge to a consumer's phone bill to also include a toll free number at which the company can be reached and the company's address. Residents who testified before the committee hearings complained that when they find unauthorized items on their phone

ber or address where the company can be reached to file a complaint.

· Increase the penalties for slamming and cramming. Already, consumers can dispute their bills when they have been slammed. and the law prohibits the company from collecting more that what the customer would have paid the old phone company for the same services. However, the task force believes that allows slammers to still make a profit. So, the task force is proposing legislation to prohibit slamming companies from collecting any fees.

 Legislation requiring background checks for anyone seeking to enter the telecommunications market in Michigan.

· Creation of a "no call" list

them up.

Toy noted that lawmakers. learning the lesson from telephone deregulation, also are proposing bills to prevent slamming and cramming when the state similarly deregulates electric and gas service. Reps. Richardville and Mike Kowall, R-White Lake, have already introduced bills to outlaw the practice in those utilities.

Nursing home dare was not an area the task force anticipated reviewing, Toy said, but the number of complaints heard by the committee prompted several recommendations for new laws including:

. Continuing the state's Elder

which would allow consumers to block phone solicitors from dialing them up.

Prescription Insurance Coverage program and promoting it better to make more Michigan seniors aware that it is available.

• Requiring criminal background checks for employees of nursing homes and county medial care facilities. Such background checks are already being proposed in leg-islation sponsored by Rep. Gerry Law, R-Plymouth.

· Requiring care facilities to provide prospective patients with writ-ten descriptions of the services they provide.

• Creating an insurance program to provide for long term care. To deal with complaints about medical claims, the task force recommended requiring use of a standardized medical claim form.

Additional recommendations of

the task force included having the Department of Consumer and Industry Services make its disciplinary data base more accessible to state residents, so they can find out when a professional licensed through the state, such as a health care provider, has been dis-

And the task force suggested legislation requiring that security deposits required by hotels be credited back more quickly to consumers' accounts. Toy said some credit card companies do not reverse the security deposit charge until as much as 30 days later. This is particularly a problem for travelers, she explained. who may quickly find their credit cards are at their limits due to unreturned security deposits.

State prepares for hot weather, ozone action days

"Ozone Action" days always occur on warm, cloudless, "gorgeous" summer days.

The sky is bright blue. It's the kind of day we wait for all winter long," said Anita Blaisus, manager of public outreach for the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments. Some folks think that if they can't see it, it's not a problem. You can see smog and that tells you the air is dirty, but you can't see ozone."

Ozone in the stratosphere protects humans from ultraviolet radiation, but at ground level, it is a pollutant. High concentrations can be an irritant to the lungs, causing breathing problems especially for sensitive people, the young, and the elderly. Those who work or exercise outdoors are also at risk because they inhale deeply as a result of their physical activity.

Laura DeGuire, environmental air quality specialist for the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality, says the effect is like a sunburn on the lungs." For most,

it is likely to be a minor problem. but repeated exposures to high levels of ozone can lead to more serious health consequences later on.

Environmental experts predict there will be a high number of Ozone Action days this summer. SEMCOG and the Clean Air Coalition of Southeast Michigan — a collection of more than 30 bustnesses and environmental and health advocacy organizations are urging citizens to participate in Ozone Action days this summer. taking steps to reduce pollution on days when the conditions are right for high concentrations of ozone.

The ozone season, running May through September, is likely, be another record-setter this year, according to Jess Jaros, senior meteorologist for the air quality division of the MDEQ. He expects to see more than the record of 25 Ozone Action days set in 1999.

The reason is that the weather is expected to be hot and dry. No, Jaros said, it is not a result of global warming. Rather, it is due to low precipitation levels during the winter and spring months. Light snow falls after January and little fumes from household cleaning

rain during the spring has left the soil in southeastern Michigan relatively dry. Moisture in the ground typically has a cooling effect, Jaros explained, carrying heat away as it evaporates. But since the ground is dry this year, higher than normal temperatures are forecasted for the

region. Jaros sald he does not expect it to be as bad as the summer of 1988, when Michigan set a record for the number of days over 100 degrees. But he does predict temperatures to be above normal. Also, there is a possibility that the drought now being experienced in other parts of the country could occur here too, later in the year.

Ozone is created when hydrocarbons — from automobile and lawn mower exhaust, industrial emissions, gasoline vapors and even

chemicals - reacts with oxides of nitrogen and sunlight. Residents can have a significant impact on ozone levels, by taking the recommended steps to reduce hydrocarbon emissions on days declared as Ozone Action days.

An estimated 58 percent of ozone comes from auto emissions, Blasius said. Residents can reduce that by driving less. "Linking trips" helps cut emissions because car engines produce less exhaust once they are warmed up, DeGuire said.

Gasoline fumes account for eight percent of the ozone. Waiting to fill up car tanks until dusk will help cut down on that portion of the problem.

If you must get gas, at least don't top off the tank, advised Blasius, a Canton resident who also serves as the manager of the coalition's

"When you fill up all the way." she said, "you just push all those fumes right back out of the tank and into the atmosphere.

Another 7 percent of the ozone levels come from lawn mower and motorboat exhaust, which have engines with no pollution controls.

"Our polls show 80 percent of the residents in southeast Michigan recognize the program and 77 percent participate in Ozone Action days in some way, taking some action. The most popular way is by not mowing the lawn. What a surprise!" Blasius said, laughing. "Our motto is grab the lawn chair, not the lawn mower.'

Residents can use Ozone Action days as an excuse to put off other chores as well. Household cleaners, degreasers and paints all add to the hydrocarbon content in the air. In fact, Blasius said, household chemicals account for another 7 percent of the ozone in the air.

Industries do contribute to the problem, according to DeGuire, but regulations have reduced their emissions drastically in recent years. There are 130 sources of industrial hydrocarbon emissions in the region and they can be made to shut down on high ozone days. she said. Still, it is not unusual for high ozone levels to occur on Saturdays, when those businesses are already closed.

The majority of ozone comes from residents.

The Clean Air Coalition's sixyear-old Ozone Action effort is a "premier" program, DeGuire said. It was one of the first in the country and has served as a model for similar programs in western Michigan and elsewhere in the Midwest.

The program gathers together meteorologists from the state MDEQ and the private sector, who meet daily to talk about weather conditions predicted for the following day. If the conditions are right. they'll issue an advisory, which is disseminated by SEMCOG.

Residents can look for advisories over the Internet by checking the SEMCOG home page at www.semcog.org. Advisories are also issued by phone, at (800) 633-3AIR. Television and radio stations and local newspapers also frequently carry the ozone advisories as part of their weather forecasts.





The number of drinks, program instructor Jerry Barnhardt said, is equivalent to a .11 Blood Alcohol Level (BAC), which is above the legal limit. Once this is entered into the cars' computer, the neon's steering and breaking responses are delayed. This is to demonstrate the slowed physical and mental responses of a driver under the influence.

With these impairments, the student drivers try to maneuver through the orange pylon course without hitting them or the cardboard pedestrians who pop up on the course.

Students are allowed to go around the track once with the car in normal mode. Once around, the instructor programs the computer with the number of drinks. As the car swerves out of control, Barnhardt calmly says, you've just hit a highway divider." As a student comes up on the "pedestrians," he

reminds the driver to watch the cardboard cut outs which lay on the ground and instructs students to hit the breaks when they pop up. The cut out, in the shape of small children, pop up but as the student hits the breaks, the car continues to roll. Even as the instructor yells "stop, stop, stop, the car refuses to cooperate.

Once the breaks are released. the car comes to a stop just as there is a tremendous thump from under the car. Barnhardt says, you've just killed a person.

While some students took their chances on the obstacle course. others were finding out what it would be like to get caught drinking and driving. Northville Police Officer and D.A.R.E. liaison to the schools, Matt Mayes, allowed students to put on night blurred vision goggles as well as daytime blurred goggles. He asked them to walk a straight line with the goggles on.

Wake me when there's an appointment

"The presidential appointments process now verges on complete collapse." So concludes Paul C. Light, of the Brookings Institution (usually a liberal Washington think tank) and Virginia L. Thomas, of the Heritage Foundation (usually conservative) in a study of the experiences of 435 cabinet and sub-cabinet officials who served in the Reagan. Bush and Clinton

Some found treatment by the White House appointments people "an ordeal."

Others — 35 percent of Regan administration appointees and 57 percent of Clinton's nominees were held hostage to the politics of the U.S.

Senate in waiting for confirmation hearings. That's one reason a lot of talented people are not about to consider appointment to top gov-

A perfect instance of this general problem concerns the nominations of two Michigan lawyers to fill vacancies on the U.S. Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals that have been twisting slowly in the wind of the U.S. Senate for far

Helene White is presently a member of the Michigan Court of Appeals; nominated by President Clinton in January 1997, Judge White has yet to receive a hearing from the Senate Judiciary Committee. Kathleen McCree Lewis. the daughter of former U. S. Solicitor General Wade McCree, is a partner in the Dykema Gossett law firm in Detroit; her nomination has been pending before the Judiciary Committee since September, 1999.

Circuit Courts of Appeals are enormously important federal appellate courts, just one step down from the U. S. Supreme Court. Appointments to these courts are made by presidential nomination, followed by hearings conducted by the Judiciary Committee and by a confirmation vote of the entire Senate.

The Sixth Circuit is authorized to have 16 judges. Currently, the Court has four vacan-

cies, one of which goes back for five years. For the Court to operate at 75 percent efficiency means long delays to the litigants and enormous workloads for the remaining judges (each of whom now has a caseload of 550 cases each year). Authorities now consider the number of vacancies in the federal court system to constitute a "judicial emergency."

What's going on here? Michigan's Senator Carl Levin, a Democrat and a minority member of the Judiciary Committee, says it's because Republicans in the Senate, hoping to win the presidency this fall, have decided to hold up judicial nominations from the Clinton White House.

As evidence, he produces a table showing that while the Democrats controlled the Senate during the Bush Administration, a total of 66 federal ludges were confirmed. However, when the GOP ran the Senate during the first term of the Clinton Administration, 17 judges were confirmed. So far in Clinton's second term, the Senate has confirmed only seven judges, with a total of 33 judicial nominees hanging fire before the Judiciary Committee without any hearings scheduled on their nominations. There are at present 81 vacancies in the federal judiciary.

Michigan's other Senator, Spencer Abraham,

is also a member of the Judiciary Committee. but as a Republican his party controls the

I asked Joe Davis, a spokesman for Senator Abraham, how come it's taken three and a half years (in the case of Judge White) and eight months (in the case of lawyer Lewis) just to get the committee to hold hearings on their nomi-

According to Davis, "Senator Abraham does not know whether or when hearings will take g place. He wants them to take place, though."

That's nice. Frankly, I suspect if Senator Abraham really wanted the Judiciary Committee to hold hearings on these nominations, he'd

find a way to do it PDQ.

A member of the Sixth Circuit, Judge Gilbert S. Merit, wrote in March a letter to Senate Judiciary Chairman Orrin Hatch: 'The Founding Fathers certainly intended that the Senate 'advise' as to judicial nominations, i.e., consider, debate and vote up or down. They surely did not intend that the Senate, for partisan or factional reasons, would remain silent and simply refuse to give any advice or consider and vote at all, thereby leaving the courts in limbo. understaffed and unable properly to carry out their responsibilities for years.

Senator Abraham is running for reelection this fall. He is stressing his performance as an effective senator in his campaign. Somebody should ask him why he can't get his committee to give two able, thoughtful and well respected Michigan lawyers the courtesy of timely hearings on their nominations to the federal judiciary that is currently hamstrung in carrying out its work.

How bad was the problem, he wanted to know. Where exactly did I live? I could hear the sounds of maps rustling the background.as I gave him the address.

The township would be spraying in a couple weeks, he said, and he'd add my lot to the list. I'd be charged for it on my tax bill. How much? He not only gave me the amount, he knew it off the top of his head.

The thing was done. One phone call. The supervisor handled it. And i've never had a problem with gypsy moths since.

Now, this just happened to be Tom Zoner, supervisor of Commerce Township. But the reason I point it out is that this kind of responsiveness is only possible in very small governments. Township government is expert at it. You couldn't hope for that kind of a response in a big city. You certainly don't get it when you are authors of Bird's Eye missed. I was reminded of this recently when reading The Future of Local Government in Michigan. a huge report put out just this month by the Michigan Municipal League Foundation. It's an examination of the role of local government in the coming century. It attempts to look at the challenges local governments face, what their strengths and weaknesses are, and what these units can do to improve services.

It begins with a paper critical of local government by the Citizens Research Council entitled "A Bird's Eye View of Michigan Local Government at the End of the Twentieth Century." I've mentioned it before in this column. There are too many local units in this state, more than 1,800, the CRC paper said. They often have overlapping responsibilities and duplicate services. Duplication can lead to inefficiencies, running up the cost of government. Taxation for all these overlapping units can be confusing. Consolidation of local governments would make things better, the CRC concluded.

able and accessible," the Michigan Township Association said in a response, also included in

That statement just about says it all. My experience with township government certainly supports the "responsive, accountable and accessible" point.

The MTA points out that township taxes are lower than those in cities, particularly big cities. If bigger governments were capable of achieving economies of scale, wouldn't they be lower in big cities? The MTA also points out that townships are often able to get the job done less expensively because they can do it with volunteers and part-timers, which cost much less than professional politicians.

The issue of local versus state government will likely come into sharper focus if a petition drive, "Let Local Votes Count," makes the ballot for this fall's election. Sponsored also by the MML, it proposes requiring a two-thirds vote of the state legislature to pass a bill that would overrule local control on some issue. It goes too far, I believe, because almost everything the state does could be viewed in that light.

But officials and bureaucrats at the state level who are preparing to campaign against it would do well to remember that there is little they can offer that rivals the ability of small governments to deliver services to residents.

No wonder residents here love their cities and townships, no matter how much the academics and policy researchers conclude there h are better ways to run a government.



Living large and having fun

Bryant Center helps students overcome disabilities

Students at the Bryant center are learning to put their abilities ahead of their disabilities, said Vocational Coordinator for the Bryant Center, Donna Case.

sion of Old Village School and takes students from 12-26 years of age. It is a special education program for students with cognitive, emotional and/or physical impairments. Students come from the 13 Western Wayne County School Districts.

Just 15 years ago these students with special needs would have had little or no chance of participating in society and for many of them, their lives would consist of a series of group homes. However, the Bryant Center program, which will soon make its move to Northville, trains students with disabilities to be productive citizens through a unique employment program. The Center analyzes students needs and abilities and pairs them with local business-

es.
It not only is beneficial to them because they get to

use the skills they have learned in a job environment, but also suddenly they are doing things non-disabled people do and they start to value themselves," Case

Students go through a battery of tests to evaluate their skills and aptitudes, Case said. They are then placed in positions suited to their skills. She said most often these are janitorial or fast food situations in over 22 businesses in the surrounding areas. However, they have expanded their program to include some light clerical work. Often the students are accompanied by a

Case said once the students graduate, they try to place them in permanent positions. Some of they are now training others who come in after them.

The center also teaches them how to create a written portfolio as well as develop a video portfolio. They train students in a variety of areas even before they get out into the world, in the center's workshop. Two

Hamilton said. Parker said she will be sad when she has to leave the program in two years because of

the friends she has made and because she has fun there. Both of the women said they had dreams of getting jobs when they leave the center. This is something Case said they could have never realistically hoped for even 10 years ago.

In her position, Case said she sees the goals of the program achieved when she sees the excitement in her students. She said on one occasion, a young man came into her office and said," I'm going to work like Dad." It's a simple thing so many paraprofessional to assist them non-disabled people take for

people live for the chance to prove they can produce something and see the results, she

to share in the same milestones as non-disabled brothers and sisters would; like getting their drivers license or going to the prom. Most of them will probably never get married or have a family. But this is one they can share. This is something they can do on their own and it gives them a great sense of self worth and something in common with non-disabled people," she said.

Just because they are disabled, Case said, they don't stop wanting what everyone else wants, she said. They want to replicate what they see in the non-disabled world and this program gives them a chance to do that to the best of their abilities, she said.

Case said they try to help students focus on their options of what they can do instead of what they can't, she said.

This is especially important to show them, she said, because of the importance of career in this country.

"It is so important for these students to realize what they are in fact capable of, she said. "Within the first sentence of describing ourselves to someone new, we tell them what we do, we define ourselves by our careers."

Since 1985, Case said she has seen a shift in the way people see the disabled through programs like this and the Americans With Disabilities Act.

We all have disabilities, it's just that some aren't as readily seeable as others. It's by realizing this that there has been this shift and we are seeing disabled people producing and giv-ing back," she said. "It's just amazing to see in my lifetime."







That's the average time a manager takes to scan each resume and decide if it goes into the 'yes' pile or the 'no' pile. Your resume must speak for you when you aren't there in person.  Make the resume elegant. Be very conscious of layout, typing and printing. Proofread it very carefully. Choose high-quality paper in a color appropriate for

your target profession. Remember, getting called for an interview happens solely on the strength of your resume. If you are one of the lucky ones called for an interview, the resume then becomes the basis for your interview. The recruiter or employer will use it to discuss your history, accomplishments, and skills to see how well they match with the company needs.

After the interview, your resume continues to represent you as your qualifications are then weighed against other candidates who have been interviewed. Those people involved in the hiring decision gather together and go over each resume again, looking for reasons to eliminate all but one candidate. Soon enough, their get-richquick scheme to rob a bank leaves them rolling in dough — but not the kind they had in mind.

Ray Winkler (Woody Allen) is an that recalls the earlier footloose alphabetical order) Tony Darrow. and fast-paced comedies, such as "Take the Money and Run" and "Sleeper." that helped Allen launch his career as a writer and director.

Allen and Tracey Uliman star as the husband-and-wife team who take a bite out of crime and get more than they bargained for.

The story of the Winklers' master plan, combined with the opportunity to work with Allen, were the key ingredients that enticed such world-class comedic stars as Ullman, Hugh Grant, and Elaine May to the project.

The film marks Ullman's third teaming with Allen, while it was the first time May and Grant had collaborated with the multiple Osear-winning director, screenwriter, and actor.

The ensemble cast of "Small Time Crooks" also includes (in

George Grizzard, Jon Lovitz, Michael Rapaport, and Elaine Stritch.

"What I was going for was a funny movie," says Allen. "Although I guess you could say if there's a theme to the film, it might be 'be careful what you wish for.'

Shooting in and around his usual Manhattan haunts, Allen relied on the talents of his longtime collaborators, including producer Jean Doumanian, co-producer Helen Robin, co-executive producers Jack Rollins, Charles H. Joffe, and Letty Aronson; produc-tion designer Santo Loquasto; and casting directors Juliet Taylor and Laura Rosenthal.

In addition, "Small Time Crooks" reunited several more recent Allen alumni, including editor Alisa Lepselter, costume designer Suzanne McCabe, and Chinese cinematographer Zhao Fei, who made his English-language debut on Sweet and Lowdown.

With a confessional style, biting humor, and a sharp yet self-deprecating intellect. Woody Allen is an auteur who creates filmic gems that audiences everywhere relate to.

mote activity. A final thought - get involved. Take your kids out for an active vacation this year, hiking or camping. Go for a family bike ride a couple of times per week. Find out what activity your child is interested in and help get them involved, i.e., karate, basketball, etc. Not only will we be helping the future of our children and our country, but we might get a little extra activity for ourselves along the way. 



Porcelain repair kits for the kitchen sink

By Gene Gary COPLEY NEWS SERVICE

Q. I have a small but noticeable chip in the white enamel finish on a kitchen sink. Can it be repaired?

A. Until recently, there was no sure-fire. long-term repair for this problem, especially if the damaged surface was subject to constant moisture. Fortunately, today there are several new products on the market that can be used to make permanent repairs and color-matching capabilities are great.

Preparation and application are simple. Begin the porcelain repair by thoroughly sanding the chipped area to remove rust and soap residue and any loose particles. Use a fine-grit emery cloth or 220-grit or smoother sandpaper. Use care in sanding, being careful not to scratch the surface outside the chipped area. After sanding, wipe the area with isopropyl alcohol. Be sure to use a clean cloth and go over the surface several times.

There are several manufacturers of repair kits, but perhaps the easiest kit to use is the two-step product line from Kit Industries. which includes a porcelain chip filler, porc-a-filler, and porcelain touch-up glaze, porc-a-fix. Unlike some other products, the touch-up glaze comes ready-mixed in various color shades designed to match different brandname appliances and fixtures.

The chip filler is recommended for deeper chips and gouges. It is applied with a spatula putty knife or flat-wood stick (such as a tongue depressor) to the damaged area. The drying time is 15 to 30 minutes. The surface is then sanded smooth with 220 or smoother sandpaper. More than one application may be necessary to fill the damaged area.

When the damaged area is completely filled and sanded, apply the porcelain touch-up glaze in the custom color which matches your fixture. Manufacturers offering similar product lines include Nu-Force Products Inc., Match-Patch. Duro's Porcelain Repair. Some of the repair





A. It's not difficult, and with care, you should be able to avoid problems if your sink is porcelain over steel. However, if it's porcelain over cast iron, it's much more difficult, if not an impossible job.

When you have a clean circle or hole, use a small cobalt drill bit and work up to the size you need. Usually this would mean starting with a three-sixteenth, then onethree-eighth to finish the job.

Q. How can I get glass shower doors clean? Water and soap scum have created a film almost impossible to remove. The tracks of the shower doors are also in the same condition.

A. There are a number of com mercial cleaners on the market that can be effective. Many of them tout their abilities to remove soap scum and the buildup of hard-water spots.

Expert offers tips on setting up fish tanks

Salt Water is infinitely more costly to set up and maintain than a fresh water tank, according to Matt Bledsoe of Aquarium Cleaning Service. Count on one inch of fish per gallon of fresh water tank, 10 gallons of water for each inch of fish in a salt water tank.

There are seven basic steps to setting up a healthy aquarium by Aquarium Pharmaceuticals,

 Location. Pick a spot away from high traffic. don't put near heating or air conditioning ducts. · Lighting. Natural light is adequate for freshwater. Fluorescent bulbs are better than incan-

descent, because they produce more light and less heat. A cover will help reduce water evaporation. In order to replicate the natural environment of the tropics, which is very bright and very clean, a salt water tank requires an adequate lighting system. With fresh water, lighting is not necessary, but it helps for viewing your tank of fish.

 Add oxygen. The water must be kept circulating, and there should be surface movement, too.

Filtration is necessary to keep out ammonia, nitrite and other contaminants. There are several types of filters to choose from, and Bledsoe is happy to advise which is best for you.

• Gravel. Make sure you use gravel specifically designed for aquariums. Other stones may release chemicals into the water that are poisonous to the fish. Rinse your gravel with tap water until it becomes clear, and then layer it two inches deep on top of the under-gravel filter.

· Plants. Live or Plastic? Live plants are beautiful, but they do demand a bit more attention soft water, a water temperature of 75-80 degrees and fluorescent lighting.

 Make sure water has been conditioned. Tap water is not recommended. Watch the temperature, it should range from 78 to 82 degrees.

1. Sweep your deck clean of sawdust. If the wood already has a finish, remove the sheen with a stiff fiber brush and a mild detergent. This will help the finish penetrate the wood.



2. Spraying tends to be a little messy.
Shield the siding next to your house with paper or plastic to protect it from the spray. Lay a sheet of plastic on the ground around the deck.



3. Spray the understructure of the deck first by coating the joists, beams, and underside of the deck.
