Authorities nab burglars on run

A crime wave that may have left 70 burglarized homes in its wake ended Tuesday with a successful manhunt conducted by police officers from Northville Township, Novi and Livonia.

Northville Township police said the 26-year-old arrested was one of two suspects sought in connection with several break-ins occurring the last few weeks in western metro Detroit. Police investigating a break-in spotted and tackled the suspect after he ran from them through several Northville Township subdivisions.

Investigators said they are still trying to determine what charges they will bring against the two suspects. Names were withheld pending arraignment.

"I have heard about them (the suspects) and to have it so close to my house is pretty scary," said Northville resident Pete Demos, who lives on Scenic Harbor, where the man was caught. "When I pulled up, they were subduing the

guy and he was putting up a little bit of a struggle. It looked pretty scary."

School to sue over shabby carpet work

The Northville School District will attempt to make a carpet company do right by their word in a court of law.

Assistant Superintendent Dave Bolitho said the district is suing Rite Floor Covering Inc. for failing to replace faulty backed carpeting in several of the schools.

The school board approved the litigation for the school district.

Rite Flooring began work on the project in February, but Bolitho said often didn't report for work when they were expected. Further, he said much of the carpeting laid had been improperly installed and caused a "trip" hazard for students.

"We will pay them for the carpet purchased," Bolitho said. "We haven't estimated the cost of the damages yet but we are looking to be reimbursed for the cost of replacing the carpet already laid."

Don Reed, owner of Rite Flooring, said he had no idea the district was suing him but it's the district that owes him money.

"I didn't know anything about a lawsuit," Reed said. "The way we look at it, they owe us money. We entered into a contract with them and they altered the contract."

Reed refused to comment further.

Bolitho tells a different story. When Rite Flooring first received the contract, he said, they asked for \$73,000 up front to purchase the carpet needed for the floors of various rooms at Amerman, Moraine, Silver Springs, and Winchester Elementaries. The company would be given the cost of labor after each project they finished, Bolitho said.

Though the company did not have a performance bond, Bolitho said they could begin work anyway.

"That was my fault. I should have gotten that right away when we signed the contracts," he said. "But I told them to start the work and get it to me which they never did."

Bolitho said the first job the

Resident encourages locals to get involved

For Mike Poterala, life is a long list of questions just begging to be asked.

As a matter of fact, the 38-year-old Northville resident has spent a good portion of his life asking questions. A successful attorney and former trustee of the Northville Public Schools Board of Education, Poterala's inquisitive nature has served him well in all sorts of situations over the years.

So convinced is Poterala of the benefit of asking questions that the father of two is developing an inspirational campaign to encourage people to ask more questions about things that concern them. "I don't know that people are prohibited from asking questions so much as they stand in their own way at times," Poterala said.

Poterala wants to change that mindset. His effort, simply named "Ask More Questions," was initiated to motivate and assist people to advocate for themselves. According to Poterala, who serves as Assistant General Counsel at Michigan State University, the effort is focused on the belief that "our collective quality of life is enhanced when individual participation in public and consumer affairs is increased."

The old high school, now Hillside Middle School, has gone through its own transformation since the students were in the building. New locker bays were added to spaces where classrooms used to be. Further, other classrooms were expanded and windows added to open up the building.

Hillside's new students said they were adapting quickly to their new surroundings even though things were much different than they were used to.

"I just moved back here from Canada," said sixth grader Phillip Tatman. "When I left, we had a homeroom and a desk we kept all our stuff in. But now, we have lockers and don't have to carry everything around. It's pretty cool."

Pay scale may have larger gaps for school administrators

There may be more raises in store for the Central Office Administrators next year.

The matter was discussed at the August 16 personnel sub committee meeting where a member of the auditing firm Plante & Moran suggested the district consider widening the differential between the lowest and highest paid central office administrators.

According to the minutes, the purpose of the meeting was to discuss comparative salary data from other districts concerning the central office administrators salary options. The minutes state the

committee will review the suggestions and data over the next several months before the board takes action.

The implementation of the new salary structure, if approved, would be set for the beginning of their fiscal year, July 1, 2001.

"We haven't taken any action yet," said subcommittee member Martha Nield. "We want a different salary schedule for the administrators and we will be discussing it throughout the year."

Nield said the district is looking to change the schedule because some of the administrators were hitting the top of the pay scale. Further, she said the district

wants to be able to stay competitive with other districts in the event they lose an administrator. She also said they want to allow the superintendent more options to reward cabinet members for "exceptional" work.

Members of the personnel subcommittee in attendance were chairperson Judy Handley, Martha Nield, Jerry Rupley, Joan Wadsworth, and Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski from the district and Jeff Rahmberg, Steve Rann and Mark Lachowicz from the auditing firm Plante & Moran.

Rahmberg, according to the minutes, said the district should consider expanding the "width" of

the present administrator salary range from 13 percent to a higher number and possibly expand the number of steps. Further, he suggested there be a five percent difference between the different levels of central office administration.

Additionally, he cited an example of a municipality which gave top performing administrators one time monetary bonuses which would not be added to the base salaries of the administrators.

Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski said this is not something they will seriously discuss before the full board until November, however, there does need to be a different step schedule in place

in the future.

He also said the district needs to be able to remain competitive in the market and again likened the district and its administrators to the CEO and board of a \$110 million corporation.

"We are really more like a \$110 million corporation than \$40 million. We are responsible for \$42 million in the K-12 program alone and \$8-\$9 million in the center programs. It's important to keep the corporate picture in mind when we are looking at salaries."

However, according to account specialist for the Michigan Department of Education Glenda Raider, this is not an accurate depiction of

how a school district is set up nor a reasonable justification for determining salaries.

"They are absolutely not similar," she said. "The biggest difference is a school district and its salaries are funded by the public, while a corporation is funded by stockholders and their salaries are not determined by them."

Rezmierski said most likely there would be no action taken by the board on this until January 2001.



Move over Wooly Bully's, Major Tooley's has Irish luck

It won't be long until the Rolling Stones are replaced by the Blarney Stone at a new Northville Township business called Major Tooley's.

Ken Mehl, owner of the restaurant, said he is pushing to open the doors of his new Irish-themed restaurant in the middle of September. The restaurant replaces the former Wooly Bully's, 43333 Seven Mile Road, which was a rock 'n' roll-themed bar.

Mehl said patrons won't recognize the inside of the facility.

"I don't think there is anything left from Wooly Bully's at all," Mehl said. "We're completely redoing the inside."

Mehl, who said in February the decor of Wooly Bully's was "appalling," also owns the Blarney Pub in Westland.

Wooly Bully's was a rock 'n' roll themed restaurant located near the intersection of Seven Mile Road and Northville Road in the Highland Lakes Shopping Center.

Decorations ranged from the two huge guitars that used to be on the building's facade to signed records and guitars of music superstars.

The bills of the former owner of Wooly Bully's, Mark Roman, were paid Aug. 28. Between back taxes owed, interest and a huge unpaid water bill, more than \$15,000 was owed to the township.

Mehl said he paid the bill as part of the deal for the restaurant.

"When I signed the deal, that all had to be taken care of," he

said. Thelma Kubitskey, Northville Township finance director, said the sale couldn't be completed until the outstanding bills were paid.

Northville Township conducted an investigation of Mehl's Westland business as a routine part of the transfer of the liquor license and found he had a clean record in that community. As a result, the transfer of the liquor license to him was approved.

In addition to the inside changes, Mehl said he will change some of the landscaping on the outside. And he said he is interested in taking down the fence around his property, which was put up after Wooly Bully's started holding car shows in the parking lot of Highland Lake.

"But that's all up to the owner of the mall," Mehl said.

Mitsubishi has probable plans to build in Northville Township

Giant automaker Mitsubishi Motors Corp. is looking to Northville Township to possibly build a 100,000 square foot facility.

Maureen Osecki, Northville Township director of planning, said a consensus reached by the planning commission Aug. 29 literally clears the way for Mitsubishi to proceed with submitting a preliminary site plan.

The company approached the planning commission to request a curb cut in the median of the island on Centennial Drive in the Northville Centennial Park industrial development to allow easy truck access. A consensus was reached that the commission would support the cut. Additionally, Wayne County has indicated they would support the cut in the park.

The company or its developer haven't submitted any plans to the township yet so details of the overall plan are still sketchy.

Osecki said she expects the consensus reached by the planning commission is the first step.

"What they were hoping for was to get a good traffic pattern for their trucks," Osecki said. "They didn't

want to be a detriment to the road and landscaping. This cut will fit those conditions."

Representatives from Mitsubishi or its development company for the site did not return telephone calls to the Northville Record.

Osecki said the company likely will submit a preliminary site plan to the township in September. Early plans call for a 100,000 square foot warehouse and office facility with room for a 29,000 square foot expansion. The facility and its surrounding property would encompass 7.17 acres in the park.

Osecki said the planning commission may have concerns about a four-acre narrow strip of land that would be between the Mitsubishi facility and Enprotech, another company building in the park.

Mitsubishi Motor Corp. had net sales of \$29.1 billion in 1999. Mitsubishi model cars include the Eclipse, Mirage, Lancer, Pajero and Cargio.

Northville School Briefs

Sorry kids
Just when students thought there would be one extra day of vacation, the district reminds parents and students they do not have the Friday before Labor Day off.

A state law enacted last summer requires school districts to give students the Friday off unless the district has already negotiated teacher contracts by the date the law was enacted.

Since Northville teachers have contracts through 2003, the school district opted out.

Computer coordinated
The Northville School District filled their newly approved technology coordinator position.

Brinton Butler will take on the job of supervising and evaluating the technology staff for the school district.

The position was posted on March 10. The district received 17 applications and interviewed four people.

The interview panel consisted of Barbara Fife, education technology resource teacher, Kathy Meyer, instructional equipment technician, Assistant Superintendent for Instructional Services Linda Pitcher, teacher Steve Sutherland and Roy Danley, Director of Personnel.

Butler was the manager of systems and computer operations for the Wellness Plan in Detroit.

He earned his bachelors from Michigan State University in 1975, a masters from The University of Iowa in 1978, and his masters of business administration from the University of Michigan-Flint.

Butler's essential duties and responsibilities will be to direct, supervise and evaluate technology personnel, chair the Citizen's Advisory Technology Education Committee and lead the district's long-range technology planning.

Further, he will lead the district in the development and implementation of all instructional and administrative applications. Butler will design and implement technical training to building technicians as well as supervise the development and maintenance of a comprehensive inventory of technology systems and materials.

Additionally, he will manage the wide area network and monitor network performance to maintain sufficient response time and provide security and anti virus devices for the network among other things.

The money for Butler's salary,

which is \$75,000, will be funded with money from the Durant lawsuit settlement.

Northville Area Briefs

New face for an old committee

The Northville City Council appointed Patrick Ryan Kennedy to fill the vacancy on the Historic District Commission August 21 at their regular board meeting.

Kennedy's term will expire January 1, 2001.

According to Kennedy's application he was interested in joining the Historic District Commission to not only serve the community but also to "represent a growing demographic in the community of active young professionals and voice their concerns and interests."

The new commission member is an engineering sales representative with Hayes-Lemmerz Intl. in Northville. Further, his application for appointment shows he has been involved with Northville's Civic Concern, blood and marrow drives as well as the Adopt-a-Highway program.

He has lived in Northville since 1974 and is working towards a second degree from the University of Michigan business school.

Electric updates

The Northville City Council waived a second reading and adopted an electrical code ordinance amending the city of Northville Code of Ordinances.





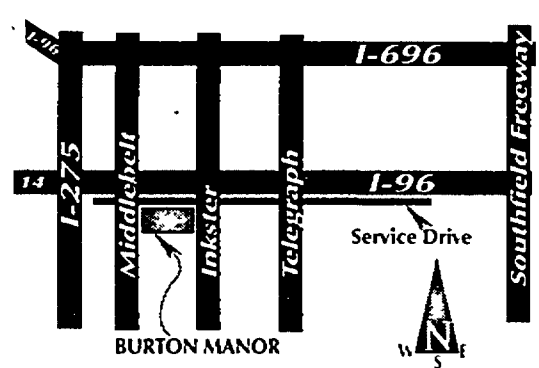

Abandoned gas station still vacant after numerous building proposals

An unsightly, abandoned gas station on the west side of Northville Township may be knocked down to make way for a new one.

But the owners of the property aren't talking and township officials haven't heard anything on the project in months.

The property in question is at the southwest corner of the intersection at Seven Mile Road and Beck Road.

George Onusko, owner of the property, could not be reached by the Northville Record.

Marv Gans, Northville Township board of trustees member and planning commissioner, said the last he had heard the plan was for a combination party store/gas station.

That was after a plan for a strip mall was rejected by the township, he said.

"We turned that project down, cause there was no way we were going to accept a big box building in that spot," Gans said.

The property in question has been the subject of countless hours and money spent on the part of the township. The problem started

in 1994 when the township notified Onusko the property had been non-conforming to proper use for a long time. Additionally, the township contended a gas station couldn't be located on the property after the property was abandoned. Onusko took the township to court. Eventually, a settlement was struck between the two parties in which Onusko would be allowed to build a new station on the property.

A plan about a year ago called for a 7-11/gas station combination at the location, however the project fell through when the unavailability of sewer service caused it not to happen.

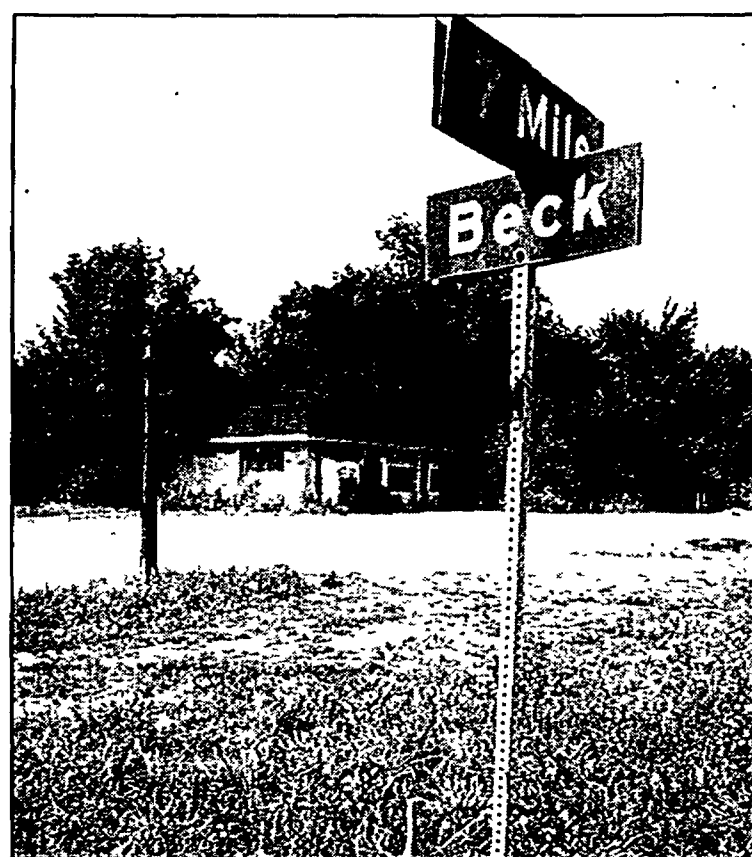


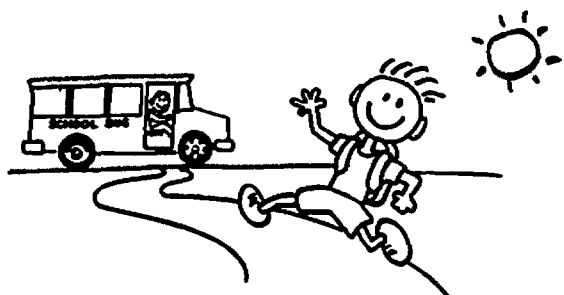

Attorney challenges citizens to ask more questions

As it turns out, Poterala was himself inspired to take action after listening to his friend and fellow Northville resident state Attorney General Jennifer Granholm deliver her inaugural address last year.

"In her speech) Jennifer challenged people to become more involved in public affairs, including running for office, as a means of improving government performance," Poterala said. "Her acknowledgment that citizens matter in government and her willingness to be so publicly accountable to them were what struck me that day and were a major inspiration in the formation of Ask More Questions."

So, armed with inspiration and motivation, Poterala put pen to paper — actually it was fingers to computer keyboard — and began fine-tuning his idea. Within the

last few months, Poterala had developed his action plan.

"Ask More Questions will focus on four actions — support voter registration drives and all means of objectively informing the public about candidates and issues; encourage people to take direct action on issues of concern; maintain a Website to provide citizens with an easy means of contacting government officials and agencies and to keep themselves informed; and distribute an inspirational line of apparel and other merchandise to help get the message out," he explained.

The Website is complete and people logging onto the site will find a variety of links that will assist in connecting them with elected officials, government agencies, and other sources like George Magazine, Project Vote Smart and League of Women Voters.

The site is located on the World Wide Web at www.askmorequestions.com.

"Many people don't realize how easy it is to contact their government officials when they have a concern about something. One goal of our Website is to make it easy and convenient for people to make such contacts," Poterala said.

Although the site encourages political involvement, Poterala stated the effort is not affiliated with any political party, candidate, or cause.

"I believe that qualified candidates can only be elected by active and informed voters, and that elected officials should act in the public interest after considering the interests of all of their constituents, not just special interests," he added.

Will the effort raise public awareness? Poterala is optimistic that his message will encourage people to become more involved in public affairs.

"People often silence themselves by assuming that their views don't matter, that they don't know enough about an issue to take part, that others will perceive their questions as dumb, or for other reasons," he said. "That's unfortunate, because most people are smarter than they give themselves credit for and their lack of involvement on any given issue creates an 'idea deficit' that hurts everyone with an interest in the issue."

"Hopefully, Ask More Questions will help inspire and encourage people to honor their own beliefs and concerns, whatever they may be, by becoming more actively involved," Poterala added.

The Northville resident hopes his public-awareness message will strike a chord with Metro-Detroiters during the fall election campaign. His efforts have already grabbed the interest of officials at MTV and Comcast Cablevision, who have asked Poterala to debut Ask More Questions during MTV's "Choose or Lose" voter registration campaign at the Pontiac Arts, Beats & Eats festival scheduled for this Labor Day weekend.

Poterale hopes the event will result in a better-informed electorate.

"Many politicians and special interests count on a low level of public scrutiny or voter turnout in order to pursue their own agendas," he said. "Based on my understanding of democracy, that's not how public decisions are supposed to be made in this country."

He also hopes his message will be picked up by young ears as well, and will encourage kids to ask plenty of questions about all sorts of topics.

"It not only helps them gather a lot of substantive information now, but develops a habit that will serve them well their whole lives," Poterala said. "People who ask a lot of questions are able to fend for themselves pretty well."

"I learn a lot as a parent from watching my own two children. It's remarkable to me how persistent and curious they are, and how much they learn from exhibiting those traits," Poterala concluded. "I've tried to incorporate those traits more into my personal life and I think they are key components of the philosophy behind Ask More Questions."

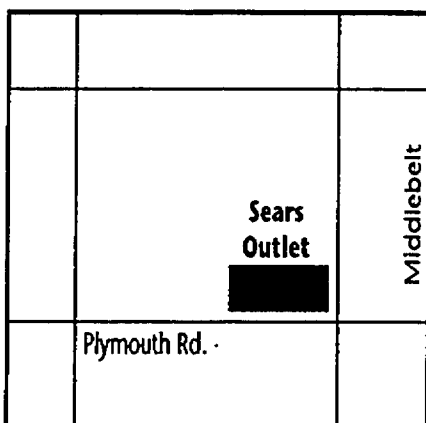

reported in Livonia condominiums and apartments. The Livonia Police Department issued a "be on the lookout" alert to area departments.

Shortly after, Northville Township police received a call on a break-in with a similar method of operation. Police said the two

would pose as utility workers and then break-in to apartments or condominiums when there was no answer. While investigating a Northville Township break-in from early Tuesday, Garbino said, the two suspects attempted to enter an occupied dwelling in the Windridge subdivision. The occupant immediately called police.

Northville Township police said

one suspect fled in a black pick-up truck and the other was on foot. Northville Township police spotted the 26-year-old on foot before he darted into a wooded area behind Meijer on Haggerty Road. That was when Northville Township contacted Livonia and Novi police to request assistance.

Livonia Police Lieutenant Ben McDermott said the suspect driving the pick-up was captured along U.S. Interstate 275 near Eight Mile Road by Livonia police.

Garbino said a perimeter was set up with 10 to 15 marked and unmarked police cars around the wooded area along with assistance from TV news helicopters and Livonia's K-9 unit. While the search was conducted in that perimeter, a Northville Township resident in the Quail Ridge subdivision said she saw a subject fitting the description running west through her yard.

"He had managed to get outside our perimeter," Garbino said. "If she hadn't called, we might not have found him."

As a result, Garbino said a second perimeter was set up during which the subject was seen by an officer in one of the helicopters in the Highland Lakes condominium subdivision. The subject then ran into the a wooded area in the subdivision.

"We then just closed in on him and applied pressure," Garbino

said. "He then tried to run."

Officers from Northville Township, Novi and Livonia were able to tackle the man near the intersection of Scenic Harbor and Lehigh Drive. He was not armed, but police found his pockets crammed with jewelry and at least \$1,000 cash on him.

McDermott said he "was sure" the individuals captured were the same individuals that had been burglarizing homes all over the metropolitan Detroit area.

"It's nice to get these guys in custody," he said.

Novi Police Detective Ron Roy said it's likely that the men are the same ones posing as meter readers as they worked neighborhoods in Novi.

"We have had about 16 condominiums burglarized and it seems like they are all related," Roy said. "We believe these are the same two individuals. The description of the vehicles and the description of the individuals match."

Roy said the homes, located in both the Crosswinds and River Oaks subdivisions, were broken into during the daytime hours of Aug. 25.

"They were taking jewelry and cash so they were not taking any bags out with them," Roy said.

School to sue for Durant III

The Northville School District seeks more money from the state with yet another Durant lawsuit.

School board members approved Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski's recommendation that the district join in part three of a lawsuit against the state, Aug. 22. Northville, along with another 250 anticipated school districts, are suing the state for underfunding special education programs since 1978.

This case involves the state taking money from the foundation balance to reimburse schools for special education. Essentially, said attorney for the school districts Dennis Pollard, the school districts are still being underfunded, except now it is in the foundation monies they receive.

Since 1999 through the school year 2002, Northville will have been underfunded by \$6 million, said school board secretary Martha Nield.

"The Special Ed Program is a wonderful program," Nield said. "But it is a pity to take money from the general education program to pay for something the state has mandated. It's really been an uphill battle."

In 1980, the Fitzgerald School

District filed suit against the state. It was later ruled under the State Aid Act that the state was required to reimburse school districts with mandated special education programs 70 percent of the cost of running the program. However the state had only been giving affected school districts 29 percent of the funding they were entitled to have.

In 1997, the courts ruled in favor of the school districts and awarded damages of which \$3.7 million went to the Northville district.

However, in 1998, the same school districts found they were still being underfunded and once again took the state to court. While the Michigan Court of Appeals found the districts were entitled to their money, a proposal regarding funding failed in the legislature by one vote.

"We had high hopes in June this would all be over," Nield said. "Hopefully with this lawsuit, we'll get the books the way they should be."

This year, over 260 districts are expected to come together to go after the state for funding.

Pollard said the next step is to get all the other school districts on board, with the expectation of filing suit against the state in October.

company finished was completely unacceptable since none of the carpet stuck to the floor. Rite Flooring was given a chance to rectify the situation which was blamed on faulty carpeting, Bolitho said. However each job they finished, including the offices at Amerman and Silver Springs, had similar problems, Bolitho said. Further, the hallway carpeting at Amerman did not extend completely to the wall causing not only ripples in the walkway but also the ends of the carpet to come up, tripping students.

All told, Bolitho said they finished two classrooms at the Mainstreet school, two hallways at Amerman Elementary, and one office and its library at Winchester. There were five projects remaining, including all of Moraine Elementary.

He said when it was clear the work already done was not going to be repaired to the district's sat-

isfaction, they would not allow Rite Flooring to continue with the other projects.

"It's terrible," Bolitho said. "For right now, we've had to use duct tape to keep the carpet down so that kids won't trip. And it looks terrible. But we can't afford to replace the carpet at this point. There's just no way."

After several meetings to try to come to an amicable resolution, Bolitho said the attorneys for the district tried to contact Reed and his lawyers with no results.

Bolitho said he does not know when the case will be filed, but it will be soon.

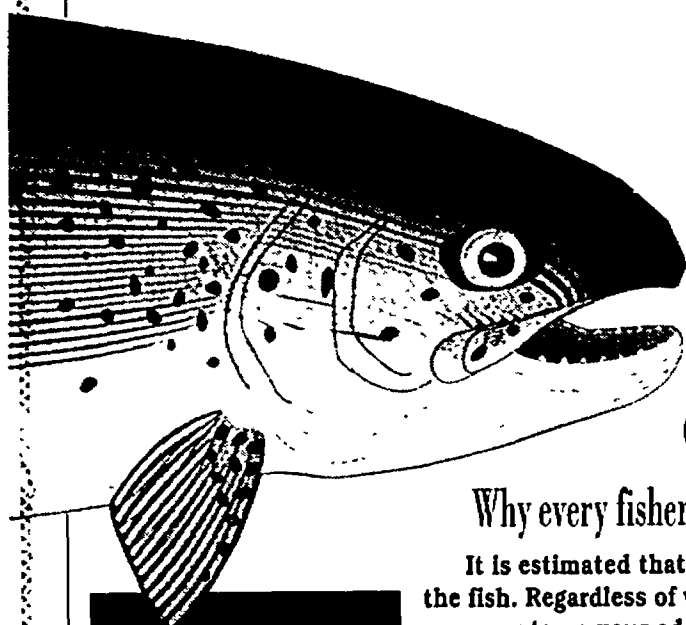

Experts told Professor Higbee that reprints were impossible, because the maps were printed in non-photographic blue.

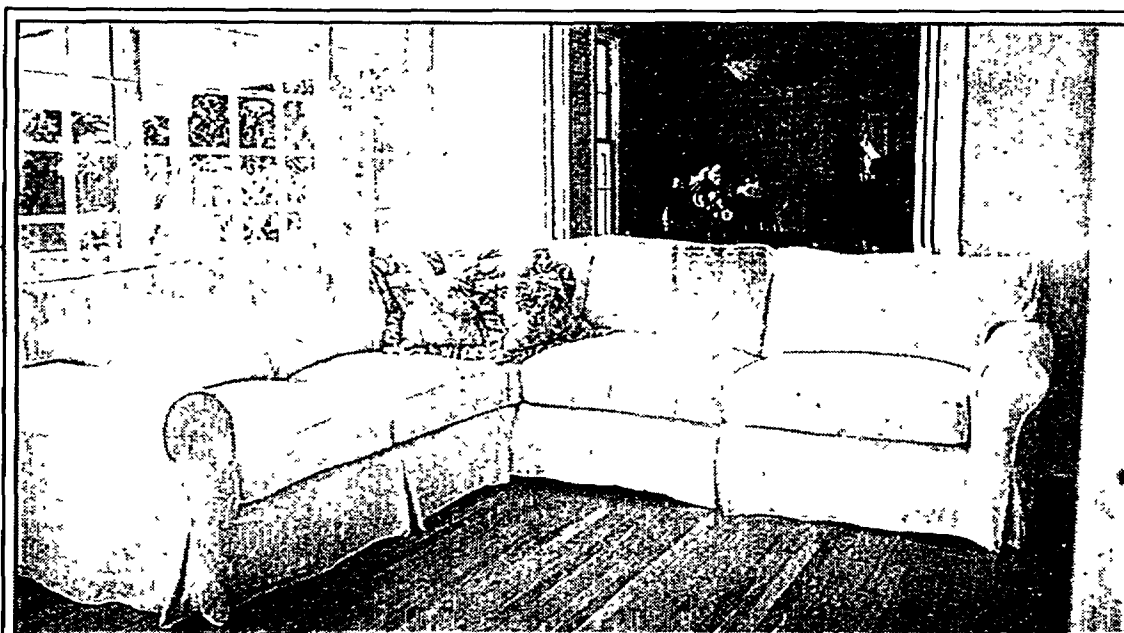
"Twain is an internationally known character so he could be popular anywhere," Webb said.

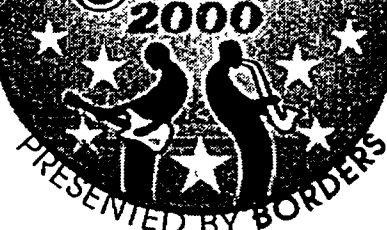

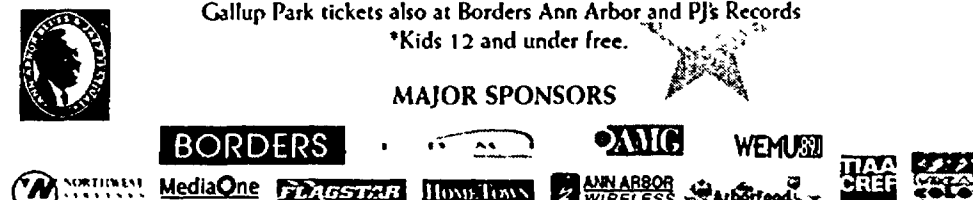

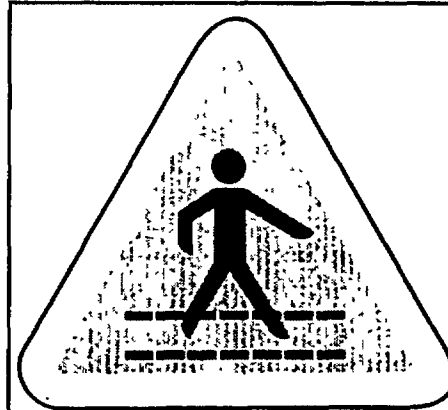

Folino has asked for recount

Northville resident and republican candidate for the 20th district state house of representatives seat Teresa Folino has asked for a recount of the Aug. 8 primary that she lost by 81 votes.

Folino, who received 2,705 votes, lost to Plymouth resident and attorney John Stewart, who received 2,786 votes.

The Wayne County board of canvassers certified the figures last week after reviewing the numbers received from city and township clerks in the 20th district.

Folino said she made the decision to ask for a recount after finding out there was only an 81-vote difference between her and Stewart.

"I talked with some of my advisors and we felt it was reasonable to ask for a recount due to all of the discrepancies throughout the process," Folino said.

The 20th district includes the City of

Northville, Northville Township, the City of Plymouth, Plymouth Township and the northwest corner of Livonia.

Stewart and Folino were two of four candidates running for the seat being vacated by Rep. Gerald Law, R-Plymouth, who is leaving due to term limits. The democratic candidate for the seat is David Grey.

Stewart did not return telephone calls to the Northville Record.

Folino said the next step in the recount process is to wait for the state to set up a date for the recount. The results of the recount will be made available that day, Folino said.

"We owe it to the voters to be sure we go by the true vote count," she said.

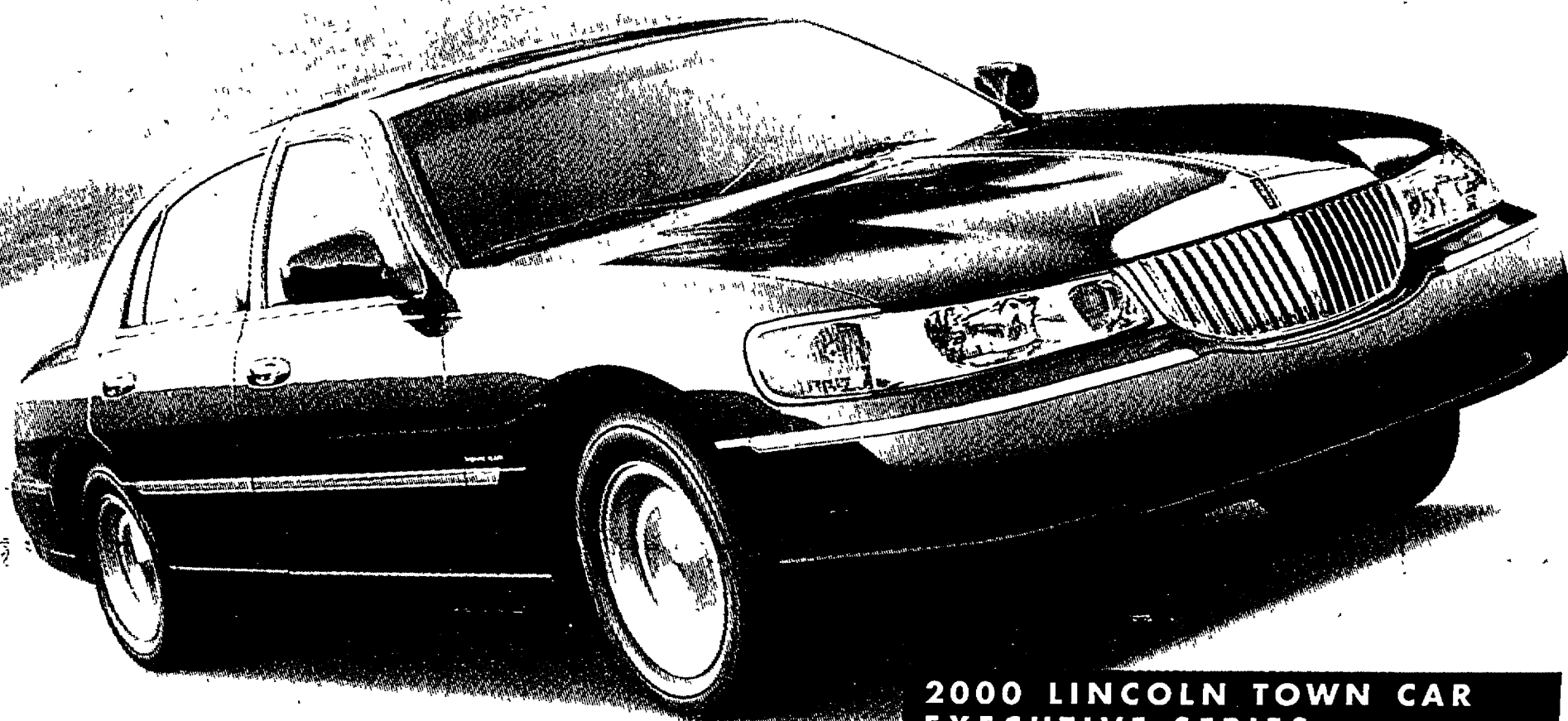

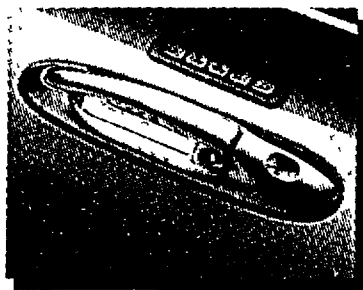

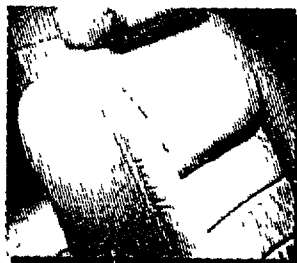

Vote, it counts for more than you may realize

This week's story on the republican primary for the state house of representatives 20th district seat proves only one thing - your vote counts.

In case you missed it, the Wayne County board of canvassers certified Plymouth resident and attorney John Stewart the winner of the primary over Northville resident Teresa Folino by 81 votes. The score was 2,786 for Stewart and 2,705 for Folino. Turnout for the Aug. 8 primary was as state officials had predicted, about 21 percent.

In the Northville Township republican primary, the score was even closer. Russ Fogg, current Northville Township board of trustee who was seeking reelection, lost by only 24 votes to challenger and newcomer to the board Brad Werner.

That's 24 people in the township who thought it was important enough to stop at a precinct before or after work or golf to make sure their voice was heard and counted.

That's 81 people in the five communities the 20th district represents who decided a trip to the voting booth took priority over cutting the lawn.

To put it in perspective, more than 81 people crammed into Northville Township Hall a few months ago

when they found out township officials had planned a bike path for in front of their homes on Winchester. We can't help but wonder how many of those people took the time to hop over to a precinct to vote in the primary. Then again, whoever wins doesn't really affect the look of a piece of property or hit the wallets, so does it even matter?

Actually it could.

Perhaps, for example, Fogg would be more inclined to hold on to a vacant piece of land than Werner,

who might be more inclined to sell the property for income even if it means turning a wooded area into a mini-mall. Maybe Fogg wouldn't support those bike paths as much as Werner.

That's 24 people in the township who thought it was important enough to make sure their voice was heard.

Maybe Folino would be more supportive of school vouchers than Stewart, which would open the doors of Northville schools to other communities.

These are all hypothetical scenarios of course.

And we would be remiss if we didn't applaud those who did vote and plan to continue to do so. It really does take almost no time at all and you get to speak through your vote and show your support.

Hopefully, we'll see you at the polls in November. The vote may be even closer.

Do school administrators make too much money?

Superintendent Leonard Rezmierski told the Record this week that the enjoyment of his job is part of his compensation.

Well, as journalists we enjoy our job and our compensation is to do a good job with present salary we have.

Can we stop paying tax dollars so the superintendent can enjoy his job?

In the last two weeks, school board president Joan Wadsworth, secretary Martha Nield, treasurer Jerry Rupley and an auditor suggested the district needs to sweeten the pot so they can keep their good administrators here and attract new ones if the need arises. They said they want the Superintendent to be able to reward his cabinet for an exceptional year, for example, with monetary bonuses.

Ok, that sounds reasonable. But extraordinary job is the key word.

The problem the district is also facing is their administrators are hitting their salary caps. Seems normal to raise the caps to the standard cost of living and to keep up with the other school district around the area.

Northville Public Schools are different, though, folks.

The administrator's pay is well above the standard of living and even well above the step scale the district set up a few years ago.

The problem is this. There seems to be no stick which to measure an extraordinary year for an administrator and there seems to be no cap in sight for administrators in Northville.

If you ask the board if the Superintendent's review is evidence of his work in the district and justification for his 3 percent raise this year, they will say yes.

However, to the best of our calculations, he went down in overall points this year by nine compared to last.

Don't worry, he still got his raise though.

If you ask the Superintendent to justify the raises for his cabinet, he'll tell you the annual report is the evidence of a fine year, as he told the Record.

Well, when a cabinet gets to write their own review, they would be doing a good job to receive a high raise. Who wouldn't?

Then they say they look at similar districts such as Novi. Which may be a good judge as to what they should make. They have a similar number of schools and administrators and are compensated slightly less than Northville.

Here's the difference: Novi's school administrators (principals and the like) and central office administrators make around the same.

There is something wrong in a system where school principals are making \$30,000 to almost \$70,000 less than the highest paid central office administrator.

We are not saying the work of central office administrators is not hard nor are we saying they need to be making pittance.

As evident in today's story on the central office contracts, Rezmierski said "We are really more like a \$110 million corporation than \$40 million. We are responsible for \$42 million in the K-12 program alone and \$8-\$9 million in the center programs. It's important to keep the corporate picture in mind when we are looking at salaries."

We'll remember that the next time we want to lower Ted Turner's salary. The school district needs to keep the most important matter at hand when it comes to giving themselves raises: are our children getting the quality education we, as taxpayers, are paying them for.

Remember, it's essentially the taxpayers that are signing their checks.

But there needs to be a substantial guide for these raises that now seem arbitrary.

There also needs to be oversight for this process whereby taxpayers are the ones who determine if the work done by the school district is worthy of the reward. After all, it is your money they are playing with.

Metroparks Deer Council sets record straight

Many people from the media, along with private citizens, have asked for information on the Metroparks Deer Preservation Council (MDPC). We are a non-profit, all volunteer group which includes concerned residents, taxpayers, and frequent park users.

Mission Statement:
To implement non-lethal solutions for deer management in our Metroparks to:

- maintain Metroparks as nature sanctuaries;
- maintain safety in our Metroparks, as well as for surrounding residents;
- establish a humane role model for today's society and tolerance for wildlife; and
- to work harmoniously with all organizations to implement a variety of non-lethal control methods.

We believe and support the following:

- There is a better, more humane, long-term and effective non-lethal way to manage deer in our Metroparks. Non-lethal forms of deer management (e.g., public education regarding deer behavior, trap and relocate, fencing sensitive areas, seasonal forage plots, etc.) can be used in

combination to create "non-crisis and livable" situations with deer.

• We are making a call for non-lethal deer management with government support and financial assistance. We met with DNR personnel, and they agreed that there is a need to research non-lethal for urban/suburban deer issues, as they often receive inquiries on this matter.

• Deer numbers and Metropark wildlife may be mismanaged for economic and political reasons. In 1995, Gov. Engler's Task Force on Hunting/Fishing convened to set goals for increasing hunting participation in Michigan with one goal being to "increase hunting opportunity in urban parks." Senate Bill 299, introduced in 1999, requires the use of hunters to kill wildlife in our Metroparks. House Bill 4633, introduced in 1999, would make our Metroparks ineligible for local recreational grants if the Metroparks impose restrictions on hunting/fishing.

We will continue to devote our energy to this matter, as we want to continue to be proud of our Metroparks and all they have to offer to us.

Election time gives air electricity

Gee, what happened? All of the sudden, election year politics is getting interesting. After several years of rather uninteresting contests, all of the sudden there are run-offs worth watching all over the Michigan landscape.

It starts at the top of the ticket. Al Gore has managed to make a horse race out of a presidential campaign that, until just a week ago, looked like slam dunk for George Dubya. And Michigan is in the unusual position of being one of a handful of states likely to make a difference in the outcome.

There are of course the important U.S. Senate and U.S. House races. Debbie Stabenow is looking to bump off Republican incumbent Spence Abraham, a contest getting a lot of attention. And then there is the Mike Rogers-Dianne Byrum contest for the eighth Congressional district in Livingston, Genesee, Washtenaw and Ingham counties. The seat, previously held by Stabenow, is up for grabs and the contest is getting national attention.

With Democrats looking to make gains in Congress, here's one the GOP could snatch away, putting the majority one seat further out of reach.

Even Michigan's Supreme Court contest is heated this year.

But don't overlook the contest for control of the Michigan House of Representatives. If Democrats could pick up just four seats there, they would wrest control of that chamber away from the Republicans. Sound unreasonable in a state so dominated by the GOP at this level? Think again.

The upshot is that 15 seats are up in the air when it would take only four to alter the balance of power.

Don't underestimate the importance of this. With Republicans in control of the governor's mansion as well as both chambers of the state legislature, Democrats have been largely relegated to playing speed-bump politics — at best, they can try to slow those party pachyderms down a bit.

And it has been most notable on issues like permits to carry concealed weapons, where it took a public outcry to get Republicans to rethink their plan to make permits more available. Other issues that have gone badly for Democrats include residency requirements and the proposal to take over Detroit schools. Attempts to curtail the powers of the Attorney General, the only statewide post held by a Democrat, have been narrowly averted.

Polling at the state House level is hard to come by, but one has been conducted. It's called the primary election. No, perhaps it isn't as scientifically accurate as the nation Harris polls. Yes, it is a flawed indicator. But it is still an indicator. And a close look at how the results came out shows some interesting things.

The Republican hold on a number of districts is precarious at best.

In incumbent Republican Laura Toy's 19th district in Livonia, Democratic challenger Michael Sullivan actually got more votes in the primary, 3,669 compared to her 2,059. Even if she picked up the 653 votes cast for another Republican, she'd still fall short.

Bruce Patterson, the incumbent Republican in Plymouth, fell short of the 3,594 votes cast for Democratic challenger Mickey Walsh. Patterson got only 2,733.

Five other Republican incumbents were battered by their Democratic challengers — Gary Woronchak by Amanda Howe in Dearborn, Jennifer Faunce by Steve Bleda in Warren, Gerald VanWoerkom by Steve Habetler in Muskegon, Jim Howell by Cheryl Hadsall in Saginaw County, and Randy Richardville by Herb Hehl in Monroe County.

A quick glance at the races shows Democrats threatening to steal away eight seats from the GOP. Of course, Republicans are threatening to take seven more seats back from Democrats. Up in the air are 15 seats.

Another Republican may have bettered his Democrat challenger — Andrew Richner beat John Anderson in Grosse Pointe — but if all the Democratic votes ended up moving to Anderson, 3,244, Richner's 2,716 votes would fall short.

Republicans pulled off a similar feat in fewer districts. The GOP's Scot Wojak did better than incumbent John Hansen out in Dexter. Fred Gallagher got the better of Democratic incumbent Doug Spade in Adrian. Patrick Miller pulled in more votes than incumbent Democratic Steve Pestka in Grand Rapids. And if the primary were the final tally, Francis Flanders would have unseated Andy Neuman out in Charlevoix. They came real close in two other districts.

The final analysis is that Republican control of the House is by no means assured. And Democrats are doing their best to make a race out of it.

One more contest that bears watching.

Vouchers are a band-aid to the problem

I'll be the first to admit it.

I attended public schools for twelve years, thirteen if you include Kindergarten.

During those years, especially in high school, I felt like I was getting a decent education even if I didn't want to be there. Now that I have graduated from college, I can look back and see I had a very good education. Most of my teachers really helped me strive to do my best. I remember the basic things that were taught and I feel I can walk out onto the street confident that I have enough intelligence to get me through life.

So why lately has it "been almost a sin to say public education is a well-balanced institution?"

Sure, there are the religious debates on which theory of evolution should be taught and whether we should allow prayer in a public school. Besides that, it is my belief that public schools can prepare students just as well as private or charter schools can. Any school has the opportunity to shine with the right teachers, administrators and students for that matter.

Public money for private institutions.

The phrase is scary, isn't it? Not only will it take away necessary funds for public education, it will also allow the accountability public schools have to be fallen by the wayside. These are private schools. The administrators have no laws saying they must let the public know how their students performed on the MEAPs, how much money is spent on programs and for teachers salaries and tax documents will not be accessible. When the private schools receive the money, they will be able to use it in whatever way they wish.

The arguments for the voucher proposal are based on the simple idea of getting students out of schools where the education is poor, like Detroit Public Schools, and into private schools where the education would obviously be better. This idea is a valiant effort and I agree that students in districts such as Detroit need a better education.

However, there are three things wrong with this theory. One, the voucher proposal will more than likely include students to accept vouchers from all school districts and not just the failing ones. Two, when the students leave failing districts, there is now less money to go to that district because of per pupil totals. The district then will not be able to improve due to lack of funds. Three, in most failing school districts including Pontiac and Detroit, there are more problems than just the administration. Vouchers will not solve issues for students who come from a dysfunctional home life. When there are problems the student brings with them from home, the student will not get a better education just because the location is different. They will still learn the same. We need to solve other social issues to give

these students a chance.

Another reason vouchers won't work is without the money that is rightfully theirs, by our tax-paying dollars, the public schools will decrease in general curriculum and athletics and special classes (which are always cut first in times of money crunching) like art and music will disappear.

For private schools, their well-being will also be in jeopardy. Why do most people send their kids to a private school? For a better education that involves smaller class sizes and more personal instruction. With the private schools then overloaded with students, it will essentially become a public school. Higher class sizes and less private instruction.

This petition also forgets that private schools usually have a cap on how many students they can take, unlike public schools which are required to take any student by law. Just because a family has the money now to send their child to a private school doesn't mean he will get in if 500 other Johnny's got there before him.

It is the United States and citizens should have the right to choose how their children are educated. However, do not punish our public schools. If they aren't providing a proper education for our children, maybe it's the reduction in money or social problems that is the true culprit.

Helping the needy

Anyone who thinks Northville doesn't have people in need has never been in the Civic Concern office on a Monday morning.

Marlene Kunz, director of the organization, said she was greeted with 23 calls on her machine Monday morning of people who needed everything from food to a mortgage payment.

But it's all in a day's work for Kunz who said her job is not so much about the giving, which has its own merits, but for the feeling she gets from affecting a change in people's lives.

"It's nothing you could ever put down on a piece of paper," Kunz said. "I wish someone could cut out my heart and see how it beats and maybe they might come close to understanding what it feels like."

The group began in 1983 when Rotarian Charles Smith opened his garage to the needy of Northville and Novi. He got the idea from standing on the corner one winter handing out papers for the GoodFellows charity organization.

"It was his thought that if people didn't have enough to buy Christmas presents, they didn't have enough for anything else either," Kunz said. "So he decided to give them Christmas all year round."

Smith, then 88 years old, opened his garage, filled it with donated items and recruited his friends in the community to help distribute it.

Enter Marlene Kunz, who at the time, was the director of the Northville Senior Center.

She said he asked her to serve as

director of the organization for awhile because he had taken ill.

"I've been here ever since," she said.

Kunz said the organization encompasses many areas. The group not only is in charge of distributing donated food to the less fortunate but they also help elderly Northvillians with prescription costs through Focus Hope. Kunz said often they are called on to help people pay delinquent bills or with free legal advice.

"From babies to seniors - no one is eliminated if they need help," she said.

Further, she said if their organization cannot help, they are a resource for people to get the help they need. She said they work closely with other service organizations in the area including churches and the Salvation Army in Plymouth.

For back to school, Civic Concern packed backpacks with the help of several churches in the area so children whose parents have to make the choice between food for the week or school supplies don't have to worry, she said.

For example, Kunz said they received a call Monday morning from the Northville police. They had found a baby sleeping in the back seat of a car in a parking lot. It turned out, she said, the baby's parents were in between apartments and couldn't get into their place until later in the week.

Kunz said because of their partnership with the Salvation Army, they were able to find the family temporary shelter until they could get into their apartment.

But this is only one of the many faces of "less fortunate," Kunz sees in

a day. Her clients run the gamut from the out of work, to the elderly, to the sick with a mortgage payment.

"We had a woman in here whose husband had gambled away all of their money," she said. "They had been wealthy, but because of that, they had nothing and came to us."

However, it is the privacy and dignity of their clientele which is their main concern, Kunz said. The hardest thing, she said, for someone down on their luck to do is to ask for help. So she and her 13 volunteers do everything they can to

keep the dire straits their clients are in private as well as making them feel as though there is no shame in receiving help from the community. They do this, for example, by setting up the basement of the senior center to look like a grocery store, said volunteer Dick Wazny. He said they take the time to separate out items and have "goodies" they might not expect.

But Civic Concern may not be for everyone, she said. It is a specific niche for people who can "bear to see the pain that comes in here,"

she said. "You have to go through the pain to get to the growing," Kunz said she recommends people come in during a distribution to see if this is something they would like to do.

From Tara to Teriyaki

Southern-style home transformed to elegant sushi restaurant

Its haunting beauty inspires like dreams of grandeur or lost memories recovered.

Standing alone in stark contrast to the post-modern homes and the retail shops that surround it, another dream has been reborn as people now fill the rooms where only a rumored ghost had previously presided.

Inside the elegant home along Nine Mile Road, the building was constructed with a vision of a bride in white descending the ornate spiral staircase where light reflects and twists through glass along the staircase landing. Charles Rogers already had the vision and all he needed was a daughter. But that dream never transpired.

Rogers, the inventor of condensed milk and an entrepreneur, had only sons and his only granddaughter did not share her grandfather's vision and eloped.

But now there is a new dream in this old house. A dream rich in history and steeped in tradition that goes back thousands of years.

Irwin Arkin, the owner of the mansion, and restaurateurs Howard Yang and Ji Woong Shin have transformed a fading piece of American history, the Rogers house, into a new restaurant called Shiro's.

Yang, sitting in the Sushi Bar area with elegant classical music concertos playing in background, is more than willing to discuss the traditional Japanese food that Shiro's provides.

"We want to show our customers we can make a great meal with good prices," Yang said. "At another restaurant, they charge \$10 for a glass of wine. We use the same wine, but will charge only \$8."

Yang also said that if you are looking for the real Japanese food, Shiro's is the place to get the authentic cuisine of the Orient. Yang said that the Japanese food ordered at Shiro's may even be more authentic to the Americanized Japanese palate in the Far East.

"In Japan, even traditional cuisine is compromised. Like Chinese food here, (it) is not real Chinese food," Yang said. "We have the (staff) to do Japanese (cuisine) the right way."

Yang and Shin are more than pleased to introduce the novice to the culinary delights that are the authentic Japanese, with a French twist. Even though the food was originally born on opposite ends of the globe, they both provide a unique, tasteful experience.

"We have sushi chefs from Japan, Korea and even French sushi chefs," Yang said.

Sauces in the French tradition

help enhance the palate and provide a bouquet of flavors. Yang is very proud of the sauces and noted that they are made fresh everyday. No leftover sauce mixtures are ever reused the way they are in many other restaurants and the ingredients are closely guarded, he said.

"I won't tell," Yang said, of the mixture of ingredients with a smile. "It's a secret."

According to Shin, the sauces are so carefully assembled that they may take up to five hours to prepare. No one knows that better than the Executive Chef Tobin Harris.

"Ginger-cured Salmon with a cucumber salad served with a wasabi cream sauce," Harris said, placing one of the house specialties before an eager customer. "Garnished with a bit of flying fish caviar."

The salmon is situated on the bottom half of the plate rolled into a rose pattern, which is slowly peeled when eaten with the caviar, both black and green, atop.

The wasabi sauce complements the fish in such a way that it actually changes when it is eaten in combination. The tastes actually alter on the palate in mid-bite.

"We match the fish to the sauces," Yang said. "Each one is prepared specifically for that meal."

Shin said that Shiro's management is willing to provide the best to their customers because they want to be a long-time member of the community. Hopes are so high, there is even talk of expansion after the eatery's only been open a few weeks.

"In a couple of years, we will put in a big glass building with a Japanese-style garden," Yang said. "He (Arkin) has the blue prints. We (are) hoping to have banquets and marriage (parties.) We also want to

have an outside barbecue."

Downstairs at Shiro's is a authentic Japanese dining area where the diners sit cross-legged on the tatami, a bamboo type of flooring which has been used for thousands of years in Japan.

"The main material is hay," Yang said, a restaurateur who originally started out in the real-estate business. "The Japanese have been living like this for a few thousand years. It's a traditional Japanese flooring."

"We had a master carpenter come from Japan and do the work," Yang continued. "All hand made. He (the carpenter) also made the sushi bar upstairs."

The Rogers Mansion has had a mixed history as a restaurant. An earlier business, Home Sweet Home, was successful, but closed when the restaurant owner pursued other life options. A later restaurant there collapsed quickly.

From the time Home Sweet Home closed and Shiro's opened was approximately two years, according to Arkin. Last year, an attempt was made to establish a Southern-style restaurant, but that never opened.

Yang was quick to point out that the finest building cannot hide the fact that the food has to be good.

"The house can be great, but the food is most important," Yang said.

Chef de Cuisine Hirofumi Taira, Chef de Partie Hwasung Kim and Sushi Chef Bong Sup Lim are an essential part to the food preparations that not only provide a meal but strategically placed, position food in a way to make it as attractive as it is delicious, reminiscent of a fine French cuisine presentation.

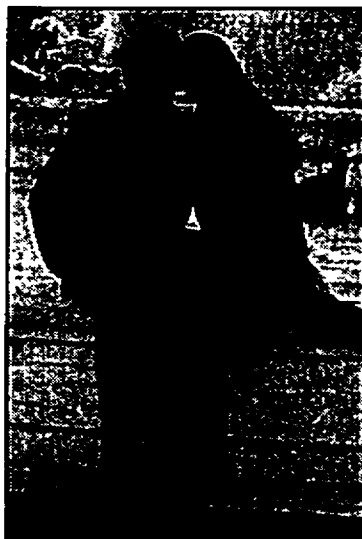

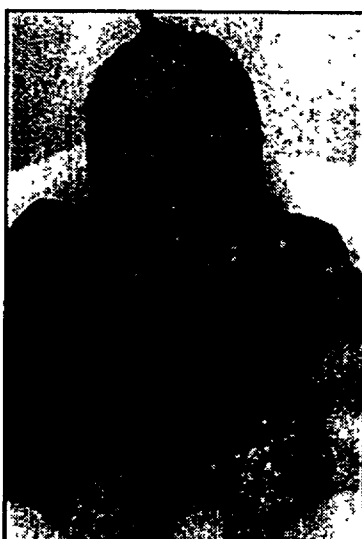

This event, held in the only city in the world named after twins, hosted approximately 3,000 sets of multiples (including twins, triplets, quads and quintos) from around the world. This year's event was the largest known annual gathering of twins (and other multiples) in the world, as documented in the Guinness Book of World Records.

Twinsburg is located between Akron and Cleveland on S.R. 91 and was named in honor of Aaron and Moses Wilcox, early settlers from Killingsworth, Conn. The town's name was changed from Millsville to Twinsburg in 1817, at the request of the twins, who also donated six acres of land that is now the city square and \$20 to start the first school. The Wilcox twins were so identical that only their closest friends could tell them apart. They married sisters, held property in common, were stricken with the same ailment and died the same day. They are buried in the same grave in Twinsburg's Locust Grove Cemetery.

The Twins Days Festival features 64 different contests.

Langston shatters school rushing record

Brandon Langston shattered the school's rushing record as Northville opened up the 2000 football season with a 34-9 pounding of Farmington last Friday night.

The junior back amassed 311 yards, topping the previous mark of 224 yards set by Rick VanBuren back in 1984. He scored on runs of 73 and 30 yards, upping his career total to 18. School record-holder Dick Biery holds the career mark of 22.

"He's cutting every other way and sometimes it's tough for the line to adjust," coach Darrel Schumacher said. "But they did a great job in there."

Schumacher credited the efforts of Chris Lebeis, Joe Rumbley, Garrett Marshall, Colin MacFarlane, Chris Smith, Mike Mueller and tight ends Darrell Adkins and Steve Shackelford for creating holes for his tailback.

With nearly 200 yards on the ground in the first half, Langston helped the Mustangs out to a 20-9 halftime lead. His 73-yard touchdown came on the first play from scrimmage on Northville's second possession.

The score gave Northville a 10-7 lead and came just moments after Farmington had scored on a 63-yard run by tailback David Peterson.

"I was really pleased with how we were able to bounce right back from that adversity," Schumacher said. "We've had our problems in the past coming back after another team

scored on us."

Northville scored again on its next possession, as junior quarterback Drew Herpich connected with senior Aaron Redden for a 24-yard touchdown. Tim Kelleher nailed down the extra point to give his team a 17-7 lead.

The senior then added his second field goal (39 yards) of the game at the 7:03 mark of the second quarter. The three points upped Northville's lead to 20-7.

The third quarter was pretty much back and forth, with neither team able to penetrate deep into the others' territory. A few mistakes here and there and some sloppy play kept the game scoreless, until Langston broke free for a 30-yard score with 5:51 left in the game.

Fellow back Ryan Anolick set up his own two-yard touchdown with a 28-yard run late in the game. He finished with 82 yards on the ground.

"We ran the ball well and were effective in our passing game," Schumacher said. "We didn't pass as much as I'd have liked to. But if you've got the running game down, you don't need to pass the ball. Even I know that."

As for the defense, the coach was equally pleased, if not moreso than he was with his offense.

"We can't overlook the defense. They gave us great field position all night long," he said.

Lebeis and Rumbley led the way on defense with eight solo tackles each. Lebeis had three

Life couldn't be going much better for the Northville cross country team than it has been the past few weeks. The Mustangs fared quite impressively in a scrimmage against Novi last Thursday and the team seems to have found a nice compliment to its best runner, Brian Bilyk.

Nick Moroz has stepped it up with his off-season workouts and finished just nine seconds behind Bilyk against the defending state champions from across the border.

"We're just really pleased with his development," coach Chris Cronin said of his junior. "It's kind of nice to have a 1-2 punch with him and Brian."

Of course Bilyk is the name everyone remembers from a year ago. The senior co-captain placed ninth at the regional meet and advanced on to the state finals where he placed 59th. He ran a 17:33 against Novi, good for third place. That time was 40 seconds better than last year's season opener, and just 25 seconds off his personal best at Cass Benton.

Boys' Cross Country

Running a solid third and fourth on the team are senior co-captain Ben Flood and sophomore Joe Lunn. Flood and Lunn ran times of 18:20 and 18:26 against Novi, both much better than last season's opening times.

"To start, there (at 18:20), we're really excited about it," Cronin said of Flood's time. "I think we can have a 1-2-3 pack in the 17s if they run well."

Cronin said Lunn is an extremely hard worker who he feels will train hard to compete with the top three on the team.

Senior Bill Dalton is currently the team's No. 5 runner and drastically improved from a year ago.

"Bill worked hard and had a tremendous track season," his coach said. "He's a fast runner, so I know that if there's 200 yards to go and he needs to pick off a couple of opponents, he will."

Following on Dalton's heels are junior Phil Santer and sophomore Mike Gabrys, along with sophomore Clark Paciorek. Both Gabrys and Santer are coming off injuries

and will slowly work their ways back to where they can be. Paciorek will not always be available to the team as he plays on the junior varsity soccer squad.

Cronin also has high hopes on freshman Tim Dalton, the younger brother of Bill.

"We have some nice depth on this team," Cronin said. "We have the potential for nine guys to run under 19. Now that's a lofty goal, but if we can do that we can make some noise."

"We're not a team like Novi though, who can afford to sit a guy out if he doesn't feel well. Sometimes we'll have to take chances."

Unofficially, the team lost to the Wildcats 23-33. The team did look good, however, taking second and third along with seventh and eighth.

"I tell you what, I was impressed with that Northville team," Novi coach Bob Smith said following the meet. "They've got a lot of good talent over there. It's always nice to be able to have a nice challenge so early in the season."

The team will compete in the Corunna Invitational today before returning home for a home meet next Thursday at Cass Benton.

Health Column

New research helping those with defects

Nine-year-old Ryan Dewald of Tawas, Mich., just wants to have a steak dinner with his parents. But because he was born with almost half of his jaw and one jaw joint missing, he can't. His face has been deformed since birth, caved in on one side and affecting not only his appearance but hindering his ability to chew, breathe and speak.

Now, Ryan is looking forward to that steak, and to a more normal life, because of treatment he's receiving at the University of Michigan Health System. In a pioneering attempt, plastic surgeon Steven Buchman M.D. has led the effort to grow Ryan almost an entire left jawbone, and a joint to connect the bone to his skull. But it didn't happen in a test tube: Buchman has been able to help Ryan's own body to grow 35 centimeters of bone and a joint where there was none before.

The process, which has previously been used only to heal fractures in large bones or lengthen or repair existing facial bones, has successfully created an entirely new structure for Ryan's tiny face. He's the second young patient to undergo such an extensive treatment at the U-M's multidisciplinary Craniofacial Anomalies Program, one of the largest and oldest in the nation.

The technique is called distraction osteogenesis - literally, growing bone by distracting, or pulling apart, the ends during the healing process. Buchman and a handful of other surgeons around the country are hopeful that with more research, the technique could be used to help thousands of children born each year with facial defects, and others with facial bone problems.

"This is a process by which new bone is formed from the old bone that was there," says Buchman, who heads the U-M craniofacial program. "You cut the bone, and when you cut it, it wants to heal. If you fool the body by moving those two cut surfaces away from each other very slowly, almost like a clock moving every day, you'll fool the body into making new bone."

In Ryan's case, distraction osteogenesis offered hope after a more conventional approach - a bone graft using part of one of his ribs - failed last year. So, Buchman and the Dewald family decided to form something from nothing in order to overcome Ryan's severe form of the congenital problem called hemifacial microsomia.

"Hemifacial microsomia is a big word, but essentially what it means is that part of his jaw did not develop" normally in the womb, Buchman says. "The jaw is the growth center for our face, so the entire part that didn't develop initially won't grow at all. Meanwhile, the normal side develops correctly, and it shifts the opposite side because there is nothing there to push against it."

Ryan's condition is actually the second most common facial birth defect, after cleft lip and palate. As many as 1 in 3,000 children are born each year with the abnormality, in varying degrees of severity. Some have an undersized mandible, or jawbone, on the affected side, and distraction osteogenesis has been used for several years to grow the bone long enough to make a joint with the skull. Patients

as young as two have been able to have it done, but only if there is some bone there to work with.

In the case of patients like Ryan, who have almost no bone to grow, and no existing joint bone to fit into the skull, a bone graft has been the only hope. Once the child is old enough to have a rib bone of sufficient size to transplant, doctors have performed the surgery in hopes that the graft will take root and become permanent.

Since Ryan's bone graft failed, Buchman and his team started from scratch, much as they had done with the other patient, who had not wanted a bone graft. After making a cut at the very end of Ryan's tiny, existing malformed bone, Buchman installed a device called a distractor beneath Ryan's cheek.

The distractor, an adjustable rod, is connected to two sets of pins, one set implanted in the bone on either side of the cut. The rod has a gear mechanism on it, which connects through the cheek to a device outside the skin. This allows Buchman or Ryan's parents to use a key to turn the gear half a millimeter at a time. Each tiny turn creates just a little more room for bone to grow in the gap between the cut ends.

"The body thinks it's going to heal a fracture, and by stretching the sides away from each other we sort of throw a little monkey wrench in the works, and the body says 'well I thought we were healing a fracture that was just that big. OK, we'll now fix one that's that big,'" says Buchman.

Ryan's only complaint is that the distractor has kept him from playing hockey and riding his bike, to protect the new bone. "Most of the time I can't even feel it, so it's pretty good," he says.

Ryan's progress has been slow and steady, but the distractor has allowed him to grow nearly 35 centimeters of three-dimensional bone. Buchman is optimistic that it will produce solid bone after a healing period ends and the distractor is removed in early fall. When it is done, Ryan will have a new main horizontal body of his left mandible, an ascending ramus, or vertical part of the mandible, and a condylar joint that articulates with the skull to make up the jaw joint. His teeth will be better aligned, and he should be able to move his jaw much better because of the new joint.

The success of Ryan's treatment, and of dozens of less-extensive distraction osteogenesis procedures around the country, encourages Buchman. But there's still more to learn, he adds.

"What the extent of the bone growth can be, and how far we can go, those are questions we're going to have to answer in the laboratory," he explains. So, he and colleagues from U-M's School of Dentistry are doing basic laboratory research to study at the microscopic level how the bone cells form and harden in the gap during distraction osteogenesis, how growth signals are sent within and between cells, and how genes govern the bone cells' action.

Buchman is also studying the long-term effects of distraction osteogenesis on the psychosocial and communication status of children who have the procedure done for facial

deformities, compared with those who do not.

Since social and psychological factors are often cited as part of the reason to make such dramatic and costly efforts to fix facial birth defects, Buchman hopes to show how the outcome and timing of each procedure affect patients in non-physical ways.

That kind of information will only add to what he says parents already know. "I think it is medically necessary to have a face that looks like a face," he says. "Only after you're a parent of a child with a congenital deformity do you realize that it's a very important thing to look normal."

As for Ryan, his experience has given him a new ambition for later in life, and a new pen pal: The little girl who has gone through the same procedure at U-M. Said Ryan, "When I grow up I want to be a doctor, because I want to help people and I've seen a lot of good things that they can do."

UM-FACTS

Facts About Hemifacial Microsomia and Distraction Osteogenesis:

• Some form of hemifacial microsomia occurs in about one in every 3,000 births, making it the second most common facial birth defect.

• Hemifacial microsomia is characterized by problems with the jaw bones, the ear, and the soft tissue in the area. It most often occurs on one side of the face, but it can occur on both.

• The cause of hemifacial microsomia is not known, but it seems to arise from a problem in early prenatal development. It has not been linked to any behaviors by the mother. There is some evidence it may have a genetic component.

• Children with hemifacial microsomia may face problems with feeding, breathing, growth, development, hearing, speech, language, learning and social integration.

• Distraction osteogenesis was first performed on leg bones in Russia in the early part of the 20th century. In 1990, the first attempt of the technique on a mandible was made.

• Currently, orthopedists perform distraction osteogenesis in long bones to heal fractures, lengthen limbs that have formed too short, and strengthen areas of bone affected by cancer.

• Several institutions in the U.S. perform distraction osteogenesis on less severe craniofacial conditions in children, while additional centers perform it for dental conditions.

A Fan for all Seasons

Fans can cool in summer
and warm in winter

Ceiling fans do far more than stir the air, they create a mood, too. "There are fans to complement every style or color in a home," said Larry Lauch, a spokesman for the American Lighting Association, a trade organization for retailers and manufacturers of lighting and fans.

"Today's fans are very decorative and provide various moods. With indirect uplighting, you can create a relaxed mood, as an example."

With the technological advances of the past 10 years, fans are more stylish, more efficient, more powerful and more useful, Lauch said. And there are fans for every room in a home and for all seasons.

By stirring the air with the blades, ceiling fans create a wind-chill effect, making one feel more comfortable in the summer, Lauch explained. Fans augment a room's air conditioning.

According to the trade association, studies show that ceiling fans use only about as much energy as a 100-watt light bulb. And by setting ceiling fans to spin in a counterclockwise pattern, a homeowner can save as much as 40 percent off summer cooling bills. Simply set

the thermostat a few degrees higher and flip on the fan, according to Lauch.

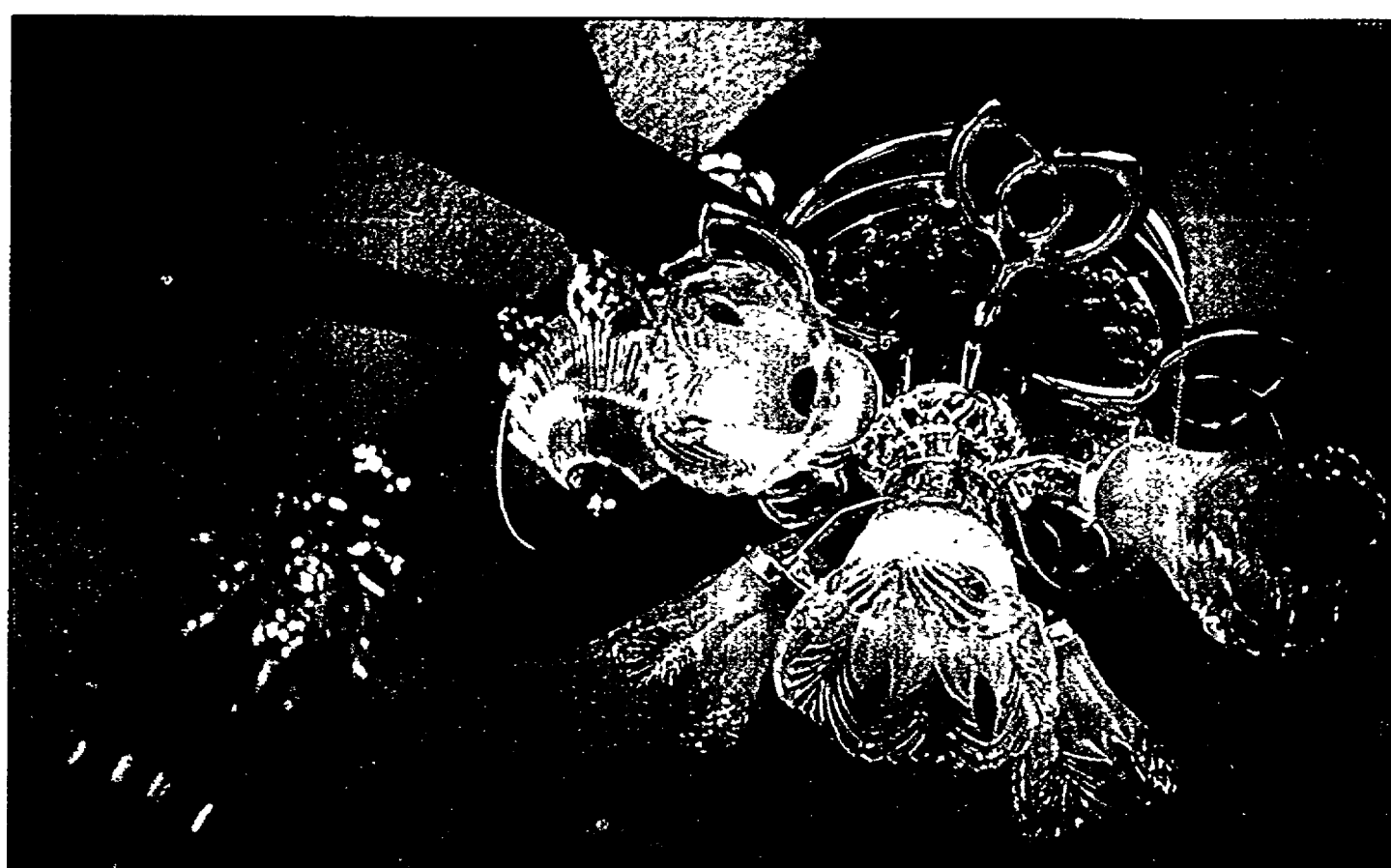
"In the winter, your ceiling fan can push the hot air at the top of those tall cathedral ceilings down into the room," he added. "You just have to switch the direction of the blades to spin clockwise."

By turning on the fan in the winter, homeowners can reduce winter heating bills by 10 percent.

Among a plethora of colors and styles, there are terra-cotta fans with unfinished ash blades; polished brass fans with rosewood blades; pewter fans with sand accents and pickled oak blades; antique brass fans with dark oak blades; and polished brass/acrylic fans with matching blades.

Many of these whirling appliances come with built-in lighting. Others work with light kits, allowing homeowners to mix-and-match light fixtures for a customized look.

There is a wide variety of lighting options. Some even come with powder-blue or hot-pink neon lights. When choosing lights, the association cautions the consumer to meet the rooms' needs. Work spaces like kitchens and home offices demand bright light. Bedrooms and dining rooms need more subdued lighting.

Each year, between 12 and 13 million fans are sold in the United States, according to Gary Ball, marketing services manager for Casablanca Fan Co.

INSTALLING A CEILING FAN

The easiest way to install a new ceiling fan is to substitute it for an existing light fixture, according to electrician, Bart Hollingsworth.

Many fans have light fixtures built into them, so you won't be left in the dark. The most important thing to consider when installing a ceiling fan is to make sure the existing fixture box will hold the weight of the fan, Hollingsworth said. If not, a metal support should be added between the joists. Tools needed for the job include screwdriver, pliers, small nut driver and wire cutters. "The job takes me about an hour to take a light down and install a fan," the electrician said. "But I've done between 400 and 500 fans."

The first step is to turn off the electricity to the site and remove the old fixture and its box. The best way to turn off the electricity is to have a light on, and go to the fuse box and unscrew fuses until the

light goes off, Hollingsworth said. And don't put on a plastic fixture box. Plastic boxes often can't hold the weight of the fan. The screws tend to strip from the weight. It should be a metal box.

Once the fixture box is positioned properly in the hole with the face flush with the ceiling, install the fan's mounting plate and thread old circuit wires through the holes in the base of the mounting plate. Hollingsworth said. Temporarily support the fan motor, as you attach the wires: black to black, white to white, bare wire to green ground wire. If the fan has a light kit, there will be a black wire with white stripes or a blue wire that should be attached to the black wire, too, the electrician said.

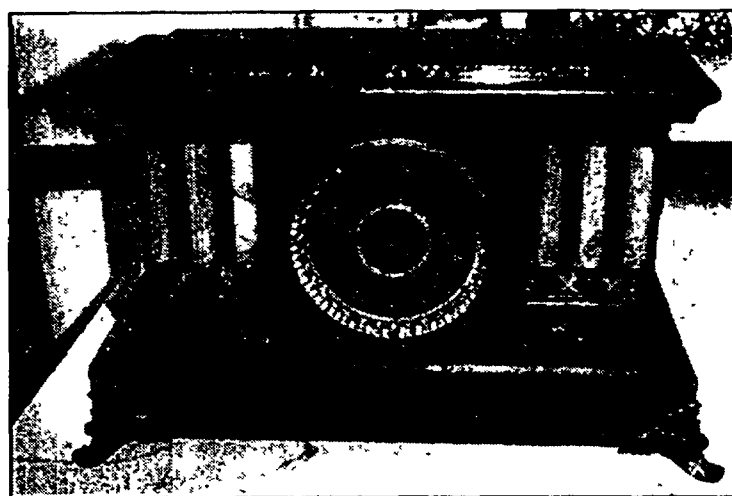
The final step is attaching the fan motor to its base, putting the fan cover over the motor and assembling the fan blades. If you have a light kit, this is the time you would mount the lights. Hollingsworth said. Installing a ceiling fan is not difficult, but if you are afraid of electricity, or you need to do a lot of wiring, call a professional.

STIRRING STYLE

Finding the fan that works best for your home is a breeze, according

to the American Lighting Association. The group offers these tips:

Bigger rooms need bigger fans. Choose a 50-56" fan for rooms up to 225 square feet and larger. Pick up a 42-44" fan for rooms up to 144 square feet. Rooms up to 64 square feet can use a 32" fan. Ceiling height is also important. For safe operation, fan blades should be at least 7 feet above the floor. A blade height of 8 or 9 feet is optimum. Look for a motor that can do the job. The amount of air moved by a ceiling fan depends on the angle, or pitch, of the blades. A pitch of 14 degrees is optimum for maximum air movement. If you want the fan to be a part of your home's decor, look for colors and detail that complement, said Gary Ball of Casablanca Fan Company. If you want the fan to disappear, choose one that matches the color of the ceiling. Look for light fixtures and filters that match your fan's finish. Ceiling fans run on electricity. Determine if you will need electrical wiring brought to the part of the room where you want to add the fan. Since most fans replace existing lights, the wiring is usually already in place. When adding a fan to the bathroom, look for one specifically designed and UL-listed for damp locations. For patio fans, opt for a fan that is UL-listed for wet locations.

Q. Enclosed is a photo of a black enameled mantel clock that I inherited from my grandparents. It was made by Seth Thomas and has a copper-colored face and lions' heads on each side. There is evidence that the feet and lions' heads were at one time gold. The clock is not running, and I hope you can tell me where I can have it repaired and what its value might be.

A. The six marbled columns, the copper-washed face, gilded feet and gilded lions' heads are typical of mantel clocks made by Seth Thomas in Thomaston, Conn. A reliable antiques dealer in your area might recommend a knowledgeable clock-repair person. Your clock was made circa 1890. Similar clocks in good working order and condition are in the \$150 to \$275 range.

Q. This mark is on the bottom of a stoneware pitcher that was my mother's. I can remember her using the pitcher to serve lemonade in the summer, and surpris-

ingly, it is in perfect condition. It is decorated with a shiny cobalt blue glaze and stands about 7 inches tall. Because it always brings back fond memories of my childhood, I could never sell it, but I would like to know if it has any value today.

A. Nelson McCoy Pottery used the mark you provided. The company made earthenware and stoneware from 1848 to about 1990 in Roseville, Ohio. Over the years, the pottery had several names as a result of mergers, reorganizations and buyouts. Nelson McCoy Pottery was the name used from 1933 until it was sold in 1967 to David Chase of the Mount Clemens Pottery Co. A similar pitcher can be seen in "McCoy Pottery Collector's Reference & Value Guide" written by Hanson, Nissen and Hanson. Your pitcher would probably be worth about \$85 to \$125.

Q. I have a child's tea set that is about 63 years old. It is decorated with the Blue Willow pattern. The set consists of 33 pieces in perfect condition and still is in the original box. Each piece is marked "Made in Japan." Could you please provide me with some information on its set?

A. Blue Willow has been a popular tableware pattern since the late 1700s. The Oriental design features three figures, birds, a bridge and trees. It was inspired by blue-and-white Nanking porcelain made in China in the late 18th century. Variations of the original pattern have been widely produced in England, Japan and the United States since the 1800s. As a rule, the pattern is a blue-and-white transfer print, but examples can be found in mauve. Your set would probably be worth about \$300 to \$500.

He lives in Novi, his kids go to Novi schools and he's involved with several organizations in the community.

But for Fred Young, life as a certified optician was made complete when he moved his eyewear business from Southfield to his hometown earlier this year.

"Because I am so involved with so many areas of Novi, I just wanted my business to be a part of it," Young said. "Even though Novi is growing, I feel like it's still a small town. I know a lot of people, and I like that."

Young's Classic Eyewear was established back in 1984 when, as an employee, Young had the opportunity to purchase the business from his boss. Then located in Southfield, Young's moved to Novi earlier this year.

In that same year Young married his wife, Jo, and they moved to Novi to start a family.

Since then Young has become involved with the Chamber of Commerce, the Lions Club, a charter member and officer in the Novi Toastmasters Club and is currently on the board of directors for Novi Youth Baseball. He, his wife and two sons are also very active with their church.

"Good ground strokes revolve around how you time the ball. Whether hitting forehand or backhand it is important to make contact in front of your body. You must work hard to get your feet in position to hit powerful shots. In the 1998 US Open, my timing was on and the result was consistent, powerful ground strokes. I did not lose a set the entire tournament and defeated top-seeded defending champion Martina Hingis 6-3, 7-5 in the final. I also ended the year ranked #1."

Lindsay's best tips...

Executing ground strokes:

Basic Types of Lighting

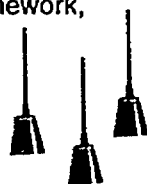
GENERAL LIGHTING provides an area with overall illumination.

Also known as ambient lighting, general lighting radiates a comfortable level of brightness, enabling one to see and walk about safely. It can be accomplished with chandeliers, ceiling or wall-mounting fixtures, recessed or track lights, and with lanterns outside your home.

A basic form of lighting that replaces sunlight, general lighting is fundamental to a lighting plan.



TASK LIGHTING helps you perform specific tasks such as reading, sewing, cooking, homework, hobbies, games or balancing your checkbook. It can be provided by recessed and track lighting, pendant lighting and portable lamps. Task lighting should be free of distracting glare and shadows and should be bright enough to prevent eyestrain.



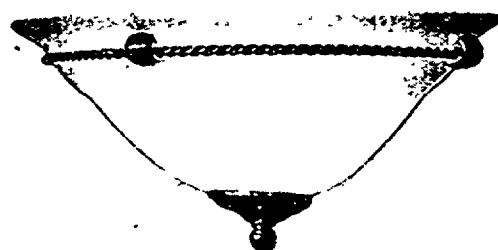
ACCENT LIGHTING adds drama to a room by creating visual interest. As part of a decorating scheme, it is used to spotlight paintings, houseplants, sculpture and other prized possessions, or to highlight the texture of a wall, drapery or outdoor landscaping.

Accent lighting requires at least three times as much light on the focal point as the general lighting around it.

This usually is provided by track, recessed or wall-mounted fixtures.



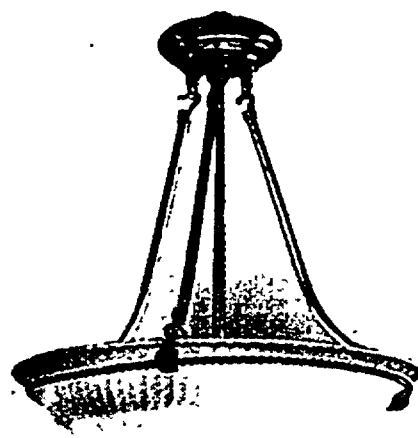
