# Size of city homes may be regulated

Bigfoot is invading Northville and the city's planning commission is taking steps to stop it.

"Bigfooting" is a building term which means that the size of a home comes close to exceeding the size of its lot due to modification or reconstruction. It also is indicative of a home which has been modified to the point that it is dramatically different from those around it.

At its Nov. 7 regular board meeting, the planning commission discussed the prospect of adding new regulations limiting the floor area, lot size and height new homes in the City.

Planning Commission member Jerry Mittman said the Commission is not ready to make any decisions. Further, he said they are considering many options and may continue the discussion at their Nov. 21 meeting.

According to city planning advisor Don Wortman, the changes were made to help maintain "neighborhood integrity and preservation standards."

However, there were mixed feelings among Northville residents about the idea of more zoning regulations.

"If they keep putting more and more restrictions on what you can do with your property, it will deter younger people with growing fami-

lies from moving into the area. And that's what brings variety and life to an area and I think that would be bad for Northville," resident Colleen Sygar said.

The planning commission has had several discussions regarding the issue of overbuilding within the city, and specifically in the historic district over the past year, Wortman said.

He said bigfooting is a trend in areas such as Plymouth, Birmingham and Royal Oak. Like Northville, those communities were attractive locations, but also established communities. What happens, he said, is that residents move in, and in extreme cases, tear down existing homes to build bigger, more modern dwellings that are often out of character for the area.

The city of Northville is gradually taking steps to rectify that problem, Wortman said. That included the passage of average setback regulations last spring as well as adopting new standards for building.

The new regulations would set conditions such that homes could match but not exceed the size of homes within 300 feet of them. In addition, the homes' appearance according to the new rules would need to reflect the others in the area. That would mean similar

# Northville energy prices could be zapped

## Deregulation could reduce consumer cost

Energy prices may drop due to the joint efforts of several municipalities, including the city of Northville.

Northville city council adopted a resolution at its regular meeting Nov. 7 to participate in the Local Energy Aggregation Project. The project allows municipalities to join together and bid out energy as

a group. The program is the result of recent electric service deregulation legislation in Michigan which allowed customers to pool their energy needs and select an energy supplier which offers the lowest reliable cost.

Department of public works director Jim Gallogly said there was a potential

savings of 5 to 25 percent to consumers on their energy bills.

Northville has joined the Michigan Municipal League, with the understanding Northville may back out if the final cost of energy is unreasonable.

"We were kind of apprehensive at first, but there are some benefits," said coun-

cilman Tom Swigart. "When communities start getting together there is a potential savings, and that's worth pursuing."

Though the city would be getting its power from an outside source, it would still be using Detroit Edison equipment to disperse the energy to homes and businesses. Some council members were concerned that if Northville was not getting its energy from Detroit Edison, the qual-

As a group, the National Merit semifinalists in Northville may be a lot of things, but "nerdy" is not one of them, the semifinalists said recently.

Northville High school seniors Powan Shiah, Kelly Wright, Emily Needham, Ben Jacobs and Christina Smmut earned the honor of being in the top one half of one percent of students in the country.

The National Merit Scholarship Corporation program is a privately financed, not-for-profit corporation. For 46 years it has awarded scholarships, underwritten by more than 600 corporations, to students scoring who score 98 percent or better on the Preliminary SAT's in their junior year.

# Township looks to purchase Bushwood

Northville Township officials plan to vote tonight on whether or not to enter into an option agreement to buy the Bushwood Golf Course and Northville Manor for \$1.4 million.

Additionally, Mark Abbo, Northville Township supervisor, said residents of the three Country Club Village homeowners' associations and the city of Northville will be asked to help foot the bill if the purchase agreement is approved.

Many details of the plan need to be worked out, Abbo said, but the owner of the property has agreed to discuss selling. The township would have four months to take the owner up on the option and be able to get out of the agreement at any time.

Taking up the option to purchase depends on other organizations the township hopes to involve.

"A lot of it depends on if the other parties involved agree to buy-in," Abbo said. "If anyone is not interested, it changes the dynamics."

A representative of the company that owns the Bushwood Golf Course/Northville Manor property, Tyebbb Properties Inc., said he had no idea if the company would take up any offers.

"We understand the township is

# School liason officer: police presence helps

Don't ask Northville High School police liaison Michael Wildt for a specific job description of what he does, because it doesn't exist.

The reason is simple: it still is being developed.

Wildt, who was reassigned to the police liaison position from the township's detective bureau, is the first full-time police liaison for Northville High School. Three months after school began, Wildt and school district officials said the

position is affecting the school positively.

Job duties of the liaison include patrolling the school's halls, rest rooms and parking lots and settling potential student conflicts.

However, Wildt said the duties are subject to change and often do. "We're still discovering what the exact guidelines are in order to set up what the basic duties will be in the future," Wildt said.

Wildt was assigned to the position for three years, he said, and

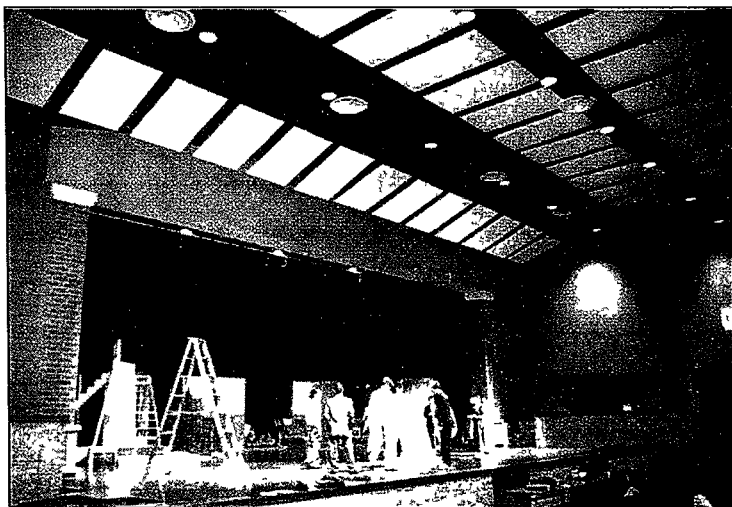

## Christmas Walk promises improvements over 1999

So what if it's cold? It's nearing the holiday season, and for Northville, that means it's time for the annual Christmas Walk — an event that had Northville Chamber of Commerce director Laurie Marrs more than a little excited.

Marrs said the big difference for this year's event will be the addition of the Farmer's Market, with participants bringing greenery to the walk to sell. Marrs said almost anything that's related to the holidays — with the exception of Christmas trees — will be on sale.

"Bandshell Park will be filled with all kinds of nice things to trim a home," Marrs said.

The Christmas Walk is the opening weekend for downtown Northville's holiday shopping season. Marrs said events like the

Walk are often a springboard for future visitation and patronage of Northville businesses, many of which will be offering free holiday treats and special activities in their stores.

"We're hoping people will come down for the walk and then stick around afterwards to shop the stores that will be open into the evening," she said.

The level of participation of the Walk can't be disputed, at least in terms of participation from non-profit groups. The Walk has increased the number of non-profits from three to 15.

"They're coming out of the woodwork for this one," Marrs said. "The popularity is definitely on the rise."

Pumpkin bread and hot chocolate will be on sale, and members of the Center Stage Dance Company will be providing entertainment

in the downtown area, Marrs said. And of course, the VIP of the Christmas season will be on hand for the Walk: Santa Claus.

"This is the one and only place where you can sit in a carriage right next to Santa Claus," Marrs said. "Some little children are afraid of sitting on Santa's lap, so this lets them sit next to him, instead."

Visits with Santa are free of charge.

Naturally, Marrs said, Northville is Santa's first stop on his annual world tour.

The Christmas Walk runs this Sunday from noon to 5 p.m. For more information, call (248) 349-7640.

### HAMLET FOOD MART FAILS ANOTHER CITY POLICE STING

Hamlet Food Mart, 1051 Novi Road, was the only business in the city of Northville to fail the most recent alcohol police sting.

The incident happened Nov. 8 at 8:39 p.m.

According to a city of Northville police report, police conducted a random alcohol police sting Nov. 8 of all businesses. During the sting, police sent an 18-year-old male into the business who was instructed to give workers his regular driver's license if they asked for it.

All businesses except Hamlet refused to sell to the man.

The report said the decoy went into Hamlet, selected a six-pack of beer and was able to purchase it despite the worker behind the counter looking at the decoy's identification, which clearly stated he was under age 21.

The worker received a citation and the store will be referred to the Michigan Liquor Control Commission.

The store was cited for selling alcohol to a minor in 1997 and for selling tobacco to a minor in 1999.

### NOVI MAN ARRESTED FOR POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA

A 19-year-old Novi man was arrested for possession of marijuana for the second time in one month last week.

The incident happened Nov. 6 at 1:10 a.m.

According to a city of Northville police report, the car was stopped in front of McDonald Ford, 550 Seven Mile Road, on Seven Mile Road, having a defective front headlight. Upon speaking with the driver, he admitted to having been arrested for possession of marijuana Oct. 12 in Westland.

When asked if he had any drugs in the car, he handed police a cigarette package that contained a bag of marijuana.

The driver was arrested and released on a \$300 bond. His car was impounded.

### INVESTIGATION TURNS UP SUSPECT IN CITY HOME INVASION

City of Northville police were able to lift a fingerprint from a home invasion on Cady Street that positively identifies a suspect.

The break-in happened Oct. 30 between 5:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m.

According to a city of Northville police report, the apartment of a Northville man was broken into and a TV and videocassette recorder were taken from it. Police investigation revealed the door likely was pushed in. They were able to obtain several fingerprints from the scene which identifies a suspect in several city of Livonia break-ins. The suspect had served five years in prison for breaking and entering.

City of Livonia police are seeking a warrant against the suspect.

### CANTON WOMAN ARRESTED FOR DRUNKEN DRIVING IN TOWNSHIP

A 27-year-old Canton woman was arrested for drunken driving in Northville Township.

The incident happened Nov. 9 at 1:48 a.m.

According to a Northville Township police report, police followed the car that was driving erratically on Seven Mile Road including stopping in the middle of an intersection for a red light.

The car was stopped in front of Deadwood Bar and Grill, 18730 Northville Road. Upon questioning

police detected a strong odor of intoxicants. She told police she had her last drink "30 hours" ago.

The woman was given a series of sobriety tests with which she had difficulty including a preliminary breath test that revealed her blood-alcohol level to be 0.155. In Michigan, 0.10 is considered to be operating a vehicle while under the influence of intoxicating liquor.

The woman was arrested and released pending sobering and posting of a \$100 bond.

### WINDOW OF NORTHVILLE MANOR FACILITY SHOT OUT

The window on the door of Northville Manor, 39430 Dun Rovin, was shot out with what appears to be a ball bearing typically used with sling shots.

The incident was reported Nov. 7 and happened between 5 p.m. the previous afternoon and 9 a.m. that day.

According to a Northville Township police report, sometime during the time period a ball bearing between .25 and .30 caliber was used to break a window on the Northville Manor.

The ball bearing was found in the driveway and it the kind typically used with sling shots, the report said.

## Alcohol, fighting nearly ends in torching of home

The combination of a family argument and alcohol exploded into a dangerous situation that almost ended with a Northville Township home burning down, police said.

Detective Paul Sumner, Northville Township Public Safety Department, said the township fire and police departments were able to contain a fire at 16745 Northville Road allegedly started by one of the home's occupants. The fire, which destroyed a large portion of the rear of the home, was put out by emergency personnel at about 6 a.m.

Police investigation revealed a 23-year-old male occupant of the home had been arguing with a 25-year-old family roommate. Both had been drinking alcohol. "We entered the facility and found no occupants, but did find the home had been ignited on the backside in two separate locations," Sumner said.

Subsequent police investiga-

tion revealed the two males had been drinking and arguing during the previous night. Additionally, investigators determined the home had been vacated rapidly.

The fire investigation team determined the back of the home had been lit in two spots, including one spot that caught on fire after some clothes had been ignited. Two bottles of barbecue lighting fluid were found nearby.

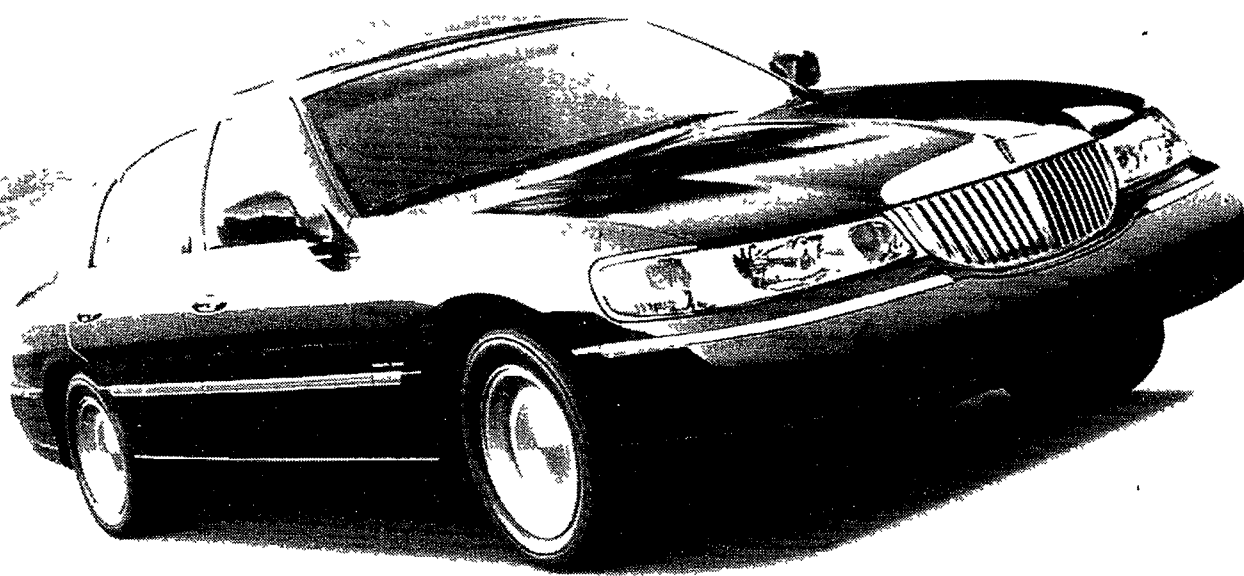
Sumner said the 23-year-old suspect was seen using a pay telephone less than 200 yards from the home and drew attention to himself.

"It was about 75 degrees and beautiful outside and I saw the subject walking with a hooded sweatshirt on, with the hood tied, and knew something wasn't right," Sumner said.

Police investigation continues, Sumner said. Charges may be sought in the case, he said.

# Transitioning team starts for Senator-elect Stabenow

After a nailbiting victory, Senator-elect Debbie Stabenow (D-Lansing) said her first order of business is to set up offices throughout Michigan for her constituents.

Stabenow said she is in the process of getting together a transitioning team and then will start on the issues that affect Michigan families.

"We have an opportunity to get things done that affect families including health care. We now have a senate vote that should be able to pass a strong Patient's Bill of Rights and I'm leading the effort to lower prescription drug costs. Schools will also be a focus on how we can offer more government support on the federal level," she said.

Stabenow said she will also be looking at ways to keep children more safe in schools and trying to make sure the budget is fiscally sound.

As Michigan's first woman senator, Stabenow said she

feels this is a special opportunity, however, she is used to being in the minority.

"I will be one in a handful of women in the Senate. Right now there are 9 women; there will be 12 or 13 depending on the outcome of Washington state. This is the most ever in U.S. history I do feel a responsibility to be a role model for young people but I've been in this situation before. Sixteen out of 110 representatives are women in Michigan," she said.

Stabenow also feels she will be able to work harder because

of Sen. Carl Levin (D-Detroit) who will be guiding her in the Senate.

"We are good friends and share the same values. It will be a different outcome because we won't have a junior senator voting differently than the senior senator and canceling out the votes," she said.

As for the election, Stabenow said she did think it would come down to the wire.

"I did think it would be close. I felt I would ultimately be successful because I'm fighting for things people care about. It was difficult going against a campaign that had an incredible amount of money behind it and misconstruing what my record was," she said. "I'm anxious for people to get to know what I'm really about, instead of the mischaracterizations that were said about me."

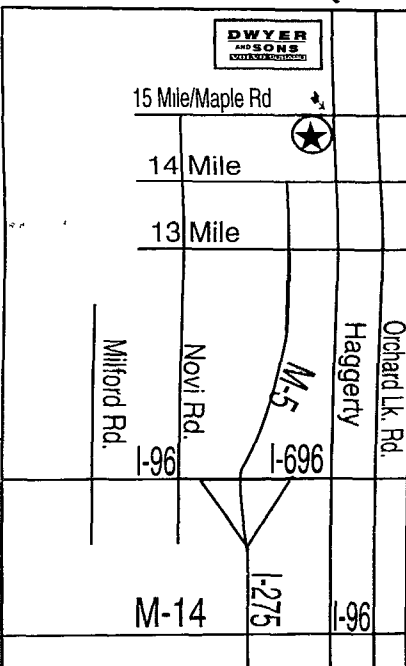

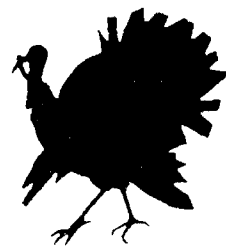

# Township man confesses to burglarizing businesses

A 41-year-old Northville Township man faces up to 70 years in prison after he admitted to police he was responsible for a series of township break ins.

Daniel Lee George was brought over to Wayne County circuit court during his preliminary hearing. He's charged with five separate breaking and entering counts in Northville Township from Oct. 14 through Nov. 4, one count of receiving and concealing stolen property and is being charged as a habitual offender because of his extensive criminal past, said Detective Paul Sumner, Northville Township Public Safety Department.

His accomplice, Susan Jean Temple, 40, Westland, faces up to 15 years for her role in one of the burglaries. Both suspects admitted to being crack cocaine users.

"It was due to the cooperative efforts of the city of Livonia Police Department and us that we were able to move forward and apprehend the subjects," Sumner said.

According to Northville Township police reports, George and an accomplice were stopped by Livonia police Nov. 4 at 8 a.m. on U.S. Interstate 96 and Farmington Road for improper plates. A

search of the car turned up a number of items, such as a sand compactor sticking out of the trunk that police suspected as stolen.

George's accomplice admitted the items had been stolen during the early morning hours at several township businesses. Subsequent investigation revealed George had been targeting mid-sized commercial businesses in Northville Township, Plymouth Township and Washtenaw County.

"He was not going into any homes," Sumner said. "He was strictly targeting commercial businesses."

Businesses George admitted to

stealing from, according to the police report, included A&K Tree Service, 16525 Ridge Road, Robins Management Group Inc., 43230 Seven Mile Road, and Executive Landscaping Inc., 46057 Sunset. The police report said George admitted to his accomplice he had been in A&K "more than most employees" of the company.

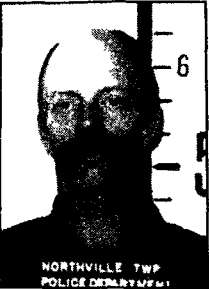
Items taken ranged from pairs of boots to commercial chainsaws, the police report said.

Temple faces up to 15 years for one count of breaking and entering and one count of receiving stolen property. She is charged in the Nov. 4 incidences only.

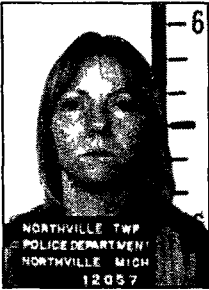
Sumner said confidential sources were able to link a city of Detroit man as the intended recipient of the stolen goods. A search of the man's home by city of Detroit and Northville Township police confirmed the information.

City of Detroit police continue their investigation of that suspect.

### FINAL SITE PLAN APPROVED FOR MILLENNIUM PARK

The Northville Township planning commission has approved the final site plan for Millennium Park.

The park is located on Six Mile Road across the street from the new Northville High School in Northville Township. Toll Bros., the company developing the Northville Hills subdivision near the intersection of Six Mile Road and Sheldon Road, is donating the time and equipment to develop the park. The estimated cost is more than \$1 million.

Details of the park include three soccer fields and four baseball/softball fields along with a 900-square-foot restroom/concession building and a single freestanding unisex restroom building. Other details include playground equipment, bike and walking paths, a picnic area and paved parking.

### EXPANSION TABLED FOR GERALD'S OF NORTHVILLE

The Northville Township planning commission has tabled a request for the expansion of Gerald's of Northville salon, 41012 Five Mile Road.

The plan was tabled because it

lacked specific information including a letter clearly explaining the scope of the project and other details.

According to the application for expansion, the owner of the salon plans to build an addition on the front of the building. The area will be used as a manicure, pedicure and facial area.

### NEW OFFICE BUILDING Tabled ON SEVEN MILE ROAD

The final site plan for a single-story office building at the northeast corner of Seven Mile Road and Maxwell Drive was tabled by the Northville Township planning commission.

The project consists of the demolition of an existing chiropractic clinic and office building to make room for the 6,337 sq. foot building. The project also includes the removal and reconstruction of a new asphalt parking lot and additional entrance drive on Maxwell and the elimination of an entrance drive on Seven Mile Road.

### LAND DIVISION APPROVED FOR PROPERTY ON CENTENNIAL DRIVE

The Northville Township planning commission approved a

requested land division for a piece of property on Centennial Drive.

The land is located in the industrial park north of Five Mile Road and east of Beck Road.

According to the application for the split, Ari-El Enterprises Inc. purchased 17.19 acres from the Wayne County Economic Development Corp. The land already has been split once into a six-acre parcel that Enrotech Mechatronics Corp. is constructing a building on.

The current request is to split the remaining acres into two parcels consisting of 7.10 acres that will be developed by the Mitsubishi Electric Automotive America Inc. and 4.08 acres for a future building.

# H2-Oh! Johnson Creek protection group formed

Johnson Creek contains the highest-quality water in Wayne County and a group of local, county and state officials want to keep it that way.

The Johnson Creek Protection Group has formed to work towards protection of the creek that contains wildlife such as trout and endangered species of fish. The group contains members of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, Wayne County Department of Environment, and the Michigan Department of Environment Quality.

The mission is simple: protect Johnson Creek.

"If we don't love it and don't love it to death, it ain't going to be there," said John Bueter, owner of Bueter's Outdoors, 120 E Main St.

The creek is a "jewel" in the area, Bueter said, and should be treated as one.

"If you look around, you don't see any warnings about eating the fish," he said. "How rare is that?"

Johnson Creek flows through Northville Township and Salem Township. The Michigan Department of Natural Resources plants trout in the creek and it is one of a few homes to the endangered red-sided dace. The conditions of

the creek, including its cleanliness and colder temperatures, facilitate wildlife needs, Jones said.

"Johnson Creek is the highest quality stream in Wayne County," said John Jones, soil erosion program coordinator for the Wayne County Department of Environment. "We would like to keep it that way."

The creek is surrounded by land being developed and Jones said that is the group's main concern.

"The group was formed as a way to recognize the development of the area which threatens the integrity of the creek," he said.

The group plans to accomplish its goal by taking on an active role in the plan and design stages of land touched by the Johnson Creek.

For example, he said, if a developer approaches the township planner with an idea, the group will be contacted to have input on

the plan and be able to offer its knowledge of the creek.

"It's not that we have not been sensitive to the creek so far, but at this point it's best for the community in the long range to be prepared," said Maureen Osiecki, director of planning for Northville Township.

The protection group gave a presentation to the planning commission in September to make members aware of the group and its intentions.

"The planning commission knows Wayne County is sensitive to Johnson Creek and all the licensing groups are working together for the environment," Osiecki said.

Additionally, she said, the land around Johnson Creek isn't necessarily being developed at a rapid pace.

"But it's always good to have a heads up and have more than one group involved for a mutual resolution," she said.

The next meeting of the Johnson Creek Protection Group is scheduled for Dec. 4 at 7 p.m. at the Northville Township Hall.

The meeting is open to the public.

# Northville Green office park stuck in Five Mile traffic jam

A proposed office park for Northville Township's east side has yet to get off the tee.

The Northville Township planning commission has tabled requests by the developers of the Northville Greens Office Park for special land use and preliminary site plan approval. The project was tabled because of traffic issues that need to be addressed, said Maureen Osiecki, Northville Township director of planning.

The Northville Green Office Park plan calls for construction of a 239,000 square foot office building space at the current site of the Oasis Golf Course. The course is located on the east side of Haggerty Road, north of Five Mile Road. The developers of the office park already have pur-

chased the Oasis Golf Course.

Several area residents have voiced concerns to the township over the development, especially with regards to traffic.

"Traffic overflow into Five Mile Road, Six Mile Road and Haggerty Road intersections is critical," said resident James Ward in a letter to the Northville Township planning commission. "Use common sense so that property values in surrounding areas are not hurt more than reasonable."

Resident David Hlavaty also had concerns and submitted a letter to the planning commission regarding traffic and the Northville Greens Office Park.

"The intersection of Five Mile Road and Haggerty Road must have a left-turn arrow added," he said. "A center turning lane from Five Mile Road to Schoolcraft along Haggerty should be added

without question and the office park should not even be considered without adding this turning lane."

In addition to resident concerns, planning officials had questions about the development.

"We suggest that the township consider either reducing the size of the project, and thereby its impacts, or, as has been done with other special use sites, ask for the applicant to contribute to a fund to improve the intersections," according to a memo to the planning commission from Progressive AE, a company that conducted the traffic impact study of the project on the area

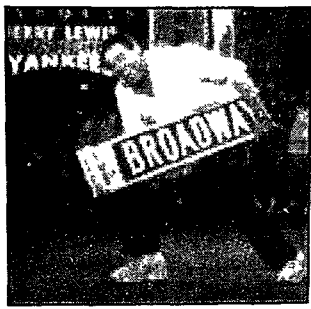

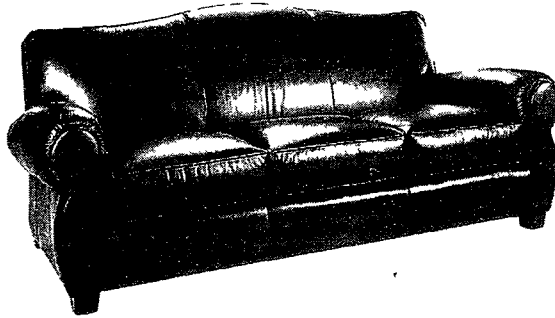

though his work day typically is 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the new high school, he still is employed by the Northville Township Public Safety Department. And while the guidelines still are being established, many of the duties already have been set.

For example, a large part of the job entails frequent walk-throughs of the high school looking for things such as students smoking in restrooms or students trying to leave the building during the day.

But enforcing the law is a small part of the job, said Dennis Colligan, Northville High School assistant principal. Wildt spends a large amount of time talking with students in and out of the classroom, Colligan said.

"We didn't want to bring in someone who was going to be just going around writing tickets," he said. "That's actually a very small part of the job."

Colligan said the most important duty Wildt has is to act as the "go-between" for the school and the Northville Township Police Department.

"It's nice to have somebody

around who can be a resource for both students and staff," Wildt said. "It was one of the side benefits we planned on having, but it's working out even better than we thought it would."

Wildt has an extensive background in law enforcement including working as a detective, patrol officer, motor carrier enforcement officer and in auto theft with the Michigan State Police.

"I'm as busy as I was working in the detective bureau but it's a different kind of busy," Wildt said. "It's like working on a different case every day. I

enjoy taking on different assignments and meeting different people."

Richard Deskovitz, Northville High School teacher, said having Wildt in the building is "great."

"Having him here is a great asset," Deskovitz said. "He works well with the staff and kids. It's kind of like having a parent around, it gives you a sense of well-being."

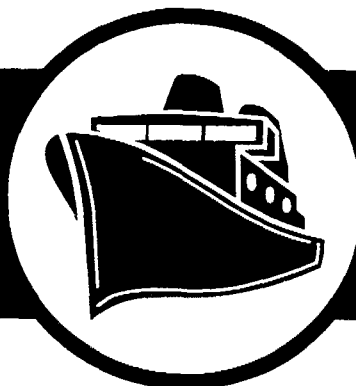

# Afghanistan to Amerman: students pay for new school

Villagers from Afghanistan have already lifted 900 bags of cement for their new school. But they still have 1,200 more to go before they sleep.

The students at Meads Mill Middle School and Amerman Elementary have been instrumental in building this new hope. This effort has been led by third grade teacher Krs Nedam who acted as translator for the students' teachers when they came here for a visit recently. She also has spearheaded the fundraising efforts in the Northville schools.

This was the first time in 25 years anyone has been granted a visitor's visa to leave Afghanistan.

Local students have raised nearly \$12,000 along with an additional \$70,000 in private donations for the children of Wordak province in Afghanistan in the past two years. They have sent money so these children may have a chance to learn in their new school and get medical treatment in their new clinic.

Both are firsts in this region of Afghanistan.

"The Northville kids have put their sweat into the finances for the school and we will put our sweat into the building," said Afghan teacher Hamauoon.

When they landed at Kennedy Airport, teachers Hamauoon and Shamsuddin with students Omaira and Hamed said it was as if they had landed on another planet. Not only were the walls of the buildings in tact, something they had never seen before, but the people were strangely different. Lovers kissed each other good-bye and families hugged in hello. Not only were they in a foreign country, but they were among foreign customs. Where they are from, people don't show such affection, Omaira said.

But the customs and clothing of Americans weren't the only things that surprised the visitors. The technology here was as foreign as the people. In their country there is little to no technology. Hamauoon said. In order to make contact with Nedam in the states, meetings had to be set up weeks in advance so the Afghan teachers may make arrangements to get to a phone. In order to call or receive mail they had to drive for two hours to Pakistan to communicate with the outside world.

It's no wonder then when they arrived in America Omaira and Hamed thought surely the automatic doors at the airport were operated by ghosts, Shamsuddin said.

Yet with all the things they saw while they were here, they all said they were terribly home sick and couldn't wait to get back.

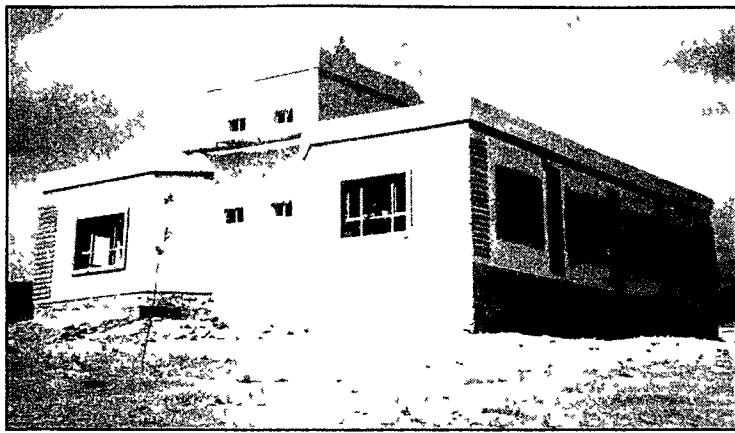
The reason they made the trip and braved the strange customs was to visit those who have been helping them for the better part of two years to build the school and the clinic.

The new school in their village is a sign of "oomed" for its people. This is hope. The hope that young men may not have to walk for two hours on broken and torn feet from lack of shoes for an education, they said. They said their school is the hope that they may have options beyond their family farms and develop aspirations of something more.

It is the hope the young men will no longer have to sit on the edges of the trees in the valley exposed to the elements to get their education. And it is the hope that girls finally will know what it is like to learn, they said.

"There is no well among the trees, so there is no water. At lunch time there is no food. When the sun is out they are in the sun. When it is raining or snowing, they are in that too," Hamauoon said.

This education is something they would traverse miles and suffer harsh conditions to get. And what they would suffer even harder for to build. They have literally built the

school rock by rock - by hand. The builders are comprised of teachers and young men and boys from the village. The men and boys climb high into the surrounding mountains with pick axes in order to chip away stone for their building. They then carry the rock back to the school and begin to build.

On their backs they carry the brick and mortar to their hope. By hand, boys as young as 10 years old lift the boulders onto ramps to add to their new futures. Their hands get ripped. Gloves can't even protect them.

Omaira said this is why she hopes to learn to be a teacher. She wants to give to her community. She wants them to understand the full beauty of an education and the opportunity it brings.

Hamed wants to learn another path. He wants to be a pilot. He said all his life he has seen the

power fighter pilots wield when he would look towards the threatening images as they flew over his village. He wants to learn to be like them, he said. He wants that kind of power. To fly over the war torn village and see it as a small speck of sand.

However, their construction has come to a halt as of late due to a drought hitting the area. They cannot continue work until they have dug their well near the school. Nedam said she is accepting contributions to send them so they can finish the project.

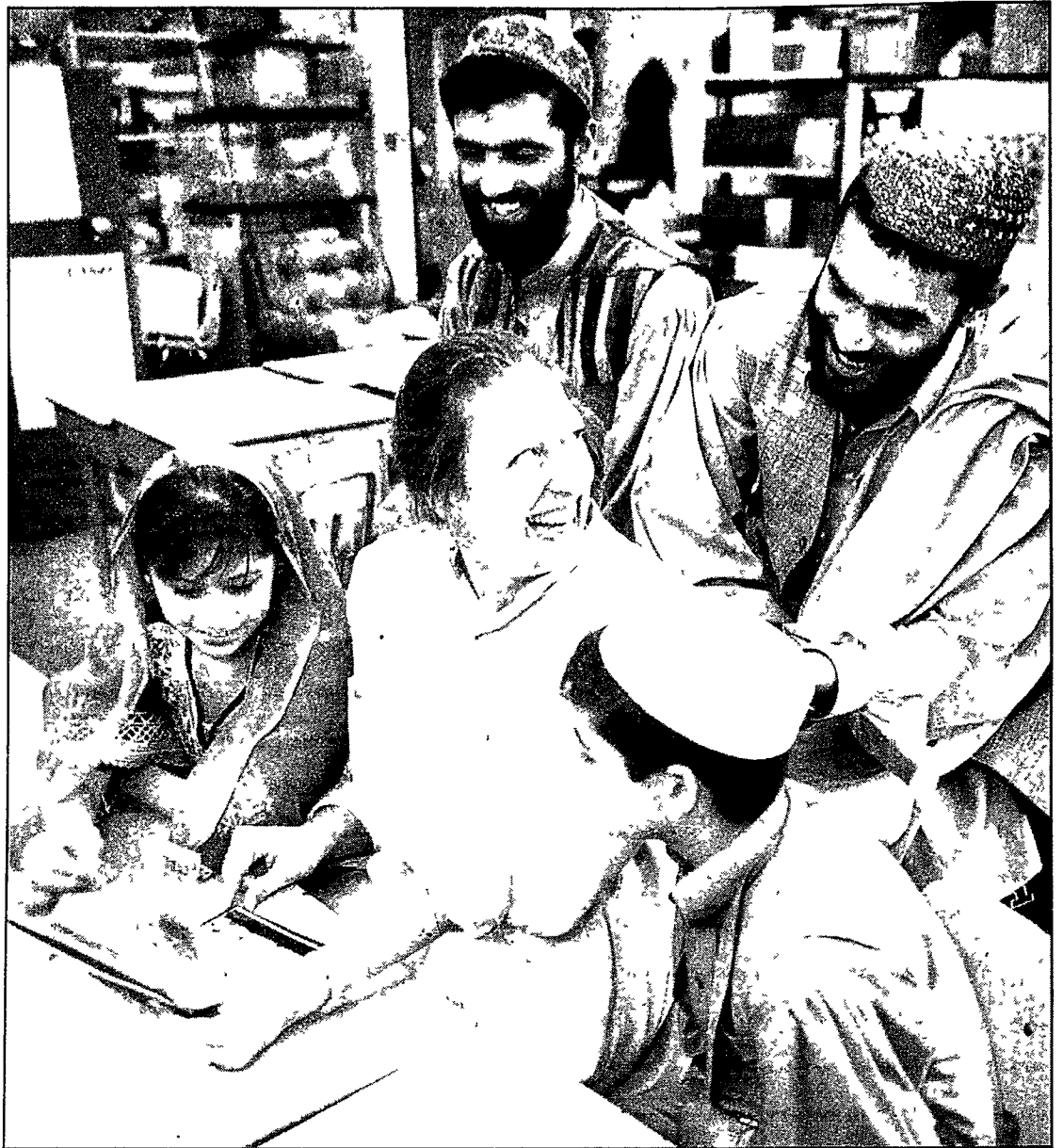

considering making an offer," he said. "We just want our customers to be assured that if they've booked or plan to book banquets or weddings, they will be honored."

Abbo said officials view the Northville Manor as an ideal building and location for a senior citizen center. Because the senior program in the Northville area is a shared service between the city of Northville and Northville Township, costs also are shared.

Additionally, possible plans for an expansion of the post office on Wing Street in downtown Northville call for the razing of the current senior citizen center on Cady Street.

"This gives us an opportunity to fill in some gaps should the post office decide to stay in the city in regards to what we may do with the senior center," Abbo said.

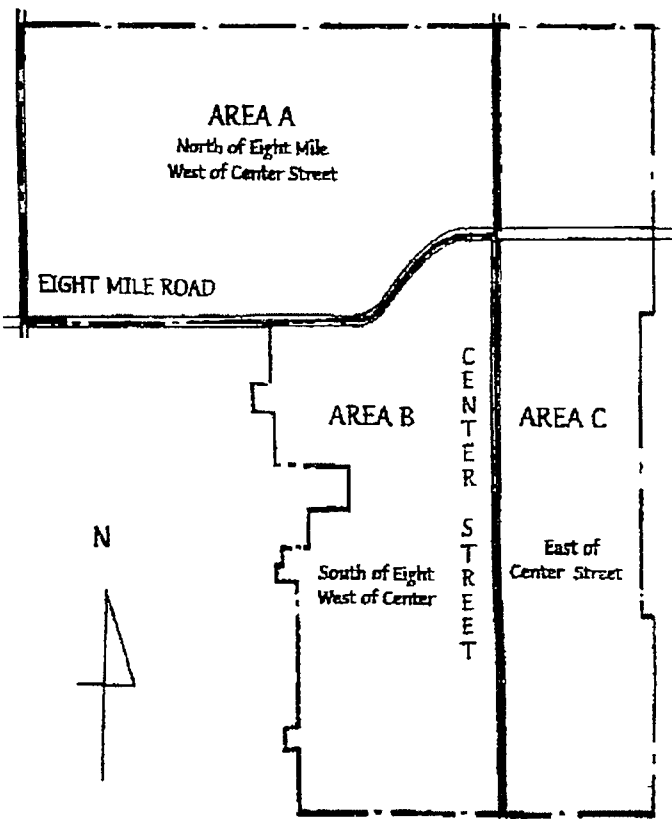

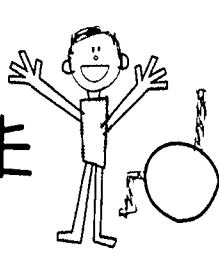

building materials and design themes would have to be used, including roof and overhang style, facade appearance, size, exterior materials, porches and garage style.

Wortman said the regulations would only apply to new homes constructed and recently approved lot splits. They would not affect existing single family homes or additions, subdivisions or condominiums built before January 2001.

Additionally, the regulations would also impose a special use approval process and a public hearing for those looking to expand their homes. Neighbors within 300 feet of the home would also have to be notified, and any additions or reconstruction of a home in the historic district would have to be approved by the historic district commission.

Northville resident Susan Presley said she didn't understand the people who relocated to the community and sought to build bigger houses in place of smaller historical houses. She said her family recently added a garage to its property but took steps to maintain the historical feel of the neighborhood.

"It's important to keep that small-town feeling. That is why people move here," she said. "The city should take steps to preserve the are. Once it's gone, you can't get it back."

However, Sygar said she didn't like the idea of the city telling people what they could or couldn't do with their property. She said the restrictions in place were adequate and that there was no need for more. Sygar also lives in the historic district, she said. But with her growing family, she said she finds the older homes often aren't big enough. She said she believed that ultimately, the regulations would deter younger families from moving to the area to the detriment of the city.

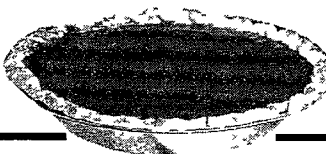

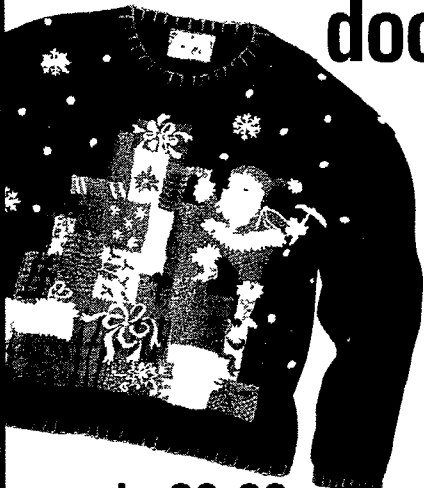

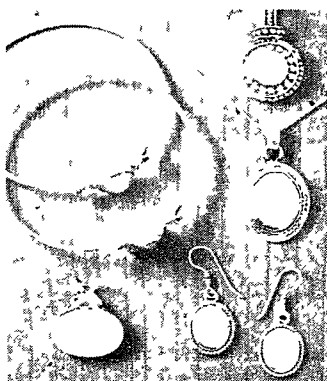

ty of their service would go down.

"There were two alternative thoughts at the council meeting — how interested are they going to be in maintaining the equipment when we are getting energy from someone else and, as [city manager] Gary Word said, there's the possibility it would increase competition and make the service better. Swigart said, 'It could go either way,'" he said.

However, Detroit Edison spokesperson Scott Simons said

the decision would not affect the service DTE delivers. He said Detroit Edison welcomed the added competition and would continue to give the same quality service.

"They are still our customers," he said. "We are not going to play any favorites. It is something we support."

Additionally, Simons said Detroit Edison couldn't "play favorites" since most municipalities were on the same DTE circuits regardless of which energy supplier they used. There would

be no way to give better service to customers using DTE energy than to those who weren't, he said.

Simons said energy is obtained and delivered in a three-branch

system. The first branch comes from the power plants generating energy. Because of deregulation, consumers may choose to go with any power company or power broker they wish. It was

that branch Northville would potentially be linking to with other municipalities.

"We supported the restructuring," he said. "We think it will improve the business climate. The city will still be served by our equipment whether they choose to go with an outside company or not their service will remain the same."

Simons said the next two branches involved sending the energy from the power plant to cities and homes. This is where DTE's equipment comes in.


Simons said DTE owns most of the transformers and high-voltage wires in the area, which is why Northville and its energy consumers would still have to pay Edison for the use of the equipment, he said.


DTE has lowered its prices since the deregulation, he said.

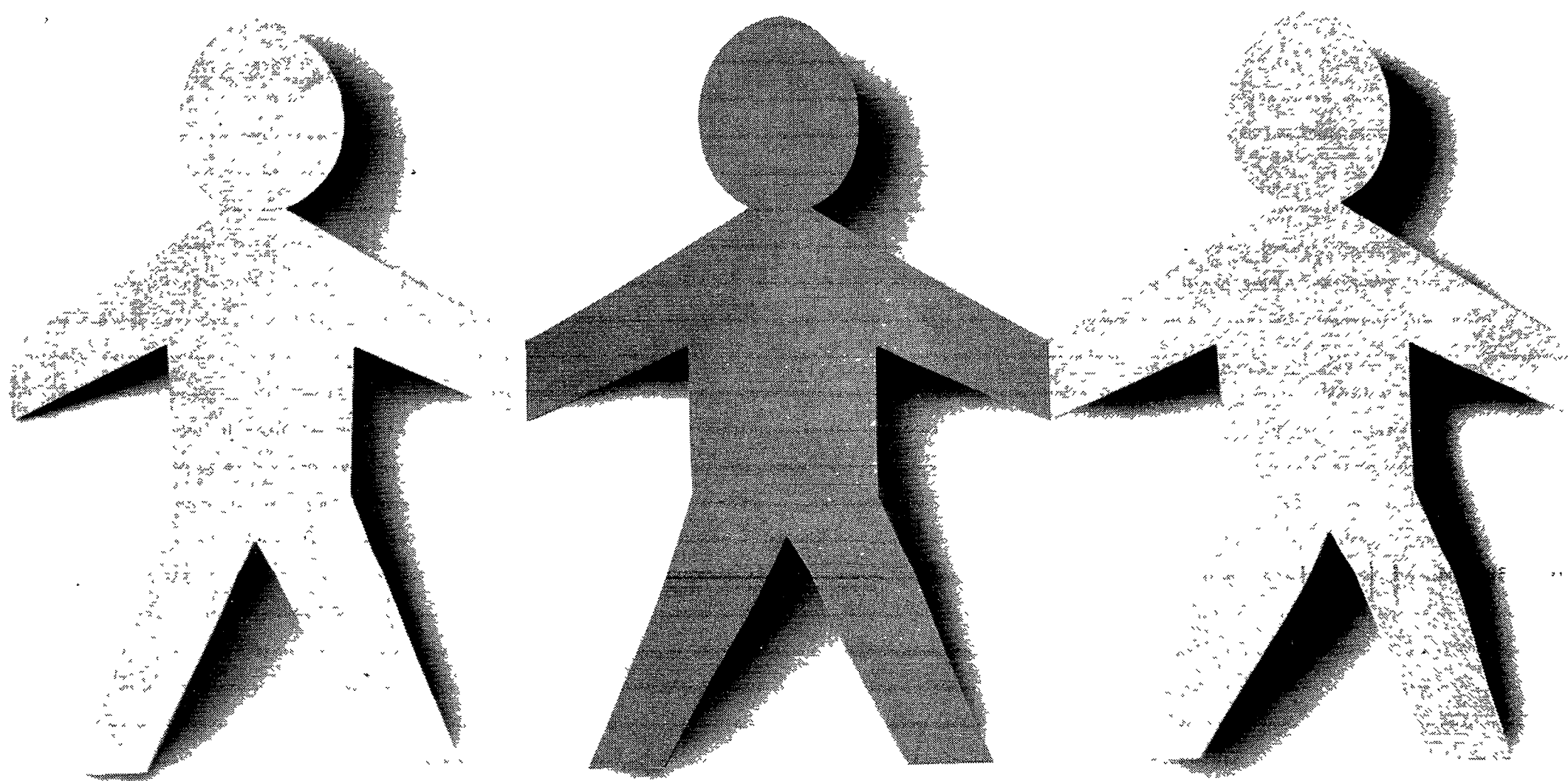

### ■ Defibrillators in Northville help out

In a discussion of the new guidelines to reduce the number of steps and skills that a potential rescuer must learn, remember, and perform, the 22nd Congress of the European Society of Cardiology in Amsterdam decided that public access defibrillation, which puts automated external defibrillators in the hands of trained lay people, as having the "potential to be the single greatest advance in the treatment of ventricular fibrillation cardiac arrest since the development CPR."

Recent advances in the design of the automated external defibrillator has made it small, simple to use, and easy to maintain.

The device can be used effectively to recognize and treat ventricular fibrillation, and in each documented episode, shock was recommended. The first shock was usually effective. Survival rates vary. The survival rates and ultimate recovery depending on the delivery of the first defibrillation shock - 74 percent less than three minutes - 49 percent after more than three minutes - in one study. Others vary from 40 percent to 1.8 percent.

An automated external defibrillator should be in one patrol car and in the 911 vehicle on call.

I am sure we have external defibrillators available but are they automated?

So I contacted the Northville City Hall and Jim Allen graciously returned my call. He informed me that the city did indeed have in use two external automated defibrillators, one for each rescue vehicle, and that they had been using them for the past two years.

As I put the phone down, I realized that this type of service and planning in all departments is what gives our community its character and makes it a good place to live.

## It's time to fix Michigan's schools

What last Tuesday's election results showed: By more than two to one, Michigan citizens don't want public money going to fund private schools via vouchers.

What last Tuesday's election results didn't show (but should have): Thousands of kids — mostly poor, minority and disadvantaged — are trapped in bad schools and shouldn't have to wait around for years hoping the schools will get better.

These kids need help and they need it now. And if they don't get it, the pro-voucher folks will be back again. Maybe they'll have a better-crafted plan than they had this time. Maybe next time they'll get their political ducks in a row and not be feuding with Governor Engler. Maybe next time they'll define a "failing school" in terms of MEAP scores instead of a relatively meaningless graduation rate.

But make no mistake — they'll be back. And they should, because it's simply unconscionable for us to ignore thousands of kids because we can't figure out how to improve — right now! — a relatively small number of cruddy schools.

The dimensions of the problem are relatively clear.

There are around 3,400 schools in Michigan. Most are pretty good and gradually getting better through the slow, steady process of school reform. But some

— I'd guess around 250 — are truly bad. Most of the bad ones are in urban areas like Detroit and Inkster, although some are in poor, rural areas.

But it just isn't true that all schools in poor urban areas are necessarily going to be bad. For example, 10 schools in the Detroit school district received "summary accreditation," the highest rating possible. Of these, three were magnet schools. But seven were "just plain, ordinary neighborhood schools, some located in what looks like a battleground, but each had a superb building principal and a dedicated staff who believe these kids can learn just like anybody else," according to State Board of Education member Dorothy Beardmore.

So where do we go from here? First, we need a big time change in attitude. A "don't bother us, we'll get there some day" approach is simply unacceptable. There needs to be a sense of urgency and a determination to get the job done, regardless of what it takes.

Second, we need to quit bickering among ourselves. Right now, we have the pro-voucher people versus the public school folks, the Roman Catholic Church versus the secularists, Gov. Engler versus Dick DeVos, the teacher unions versus the right wing, the Democrats versus the Republicans. That's a recipe for failure.

I'd suggest a statewide summit devoted specifically to identifying and fixing every failing school in Michigan. Hold it now, not some time later. Invite everybody with a stake, not just the usual suspects. And insist on results.

If the problem is money, ask the legislature to skip yet another tax cut and appropriate supplementary grants targeted solely to the failing schools. If the problem is class size or poor teachers, go to the same people who forked over the \$19 million

spent on the voucher campaign and raise money to hire and train teachers. If the problem is encrusted regulations or restrictive teacher contracts, repeal the regulations and beat up on the unions to rewrite the contracts in poor schools.

I asked John Austin, who was elected to the State Board of Education last Tuesday, if he thought a summit would help.

"I'd endorse the idea," he said. "We need to double the urgency about improving under-achieving schools and not let the educators off the hook."

Lou Battaglieri, who led the Michigan Education Association in the fight against the voucher proposal, agreed.

"Sure, we'd come," he said. "We know we don't have all the answers. We'd be happy to sit down with anybody. And we'd put any subject on the table."

If the leading stakeholders in public education in Michigan are willing to get it on, can those who tried to make the point about thousands of kids being trapped in failing schools really refuse?

## The infection of election correction

Warm up the time machine 'cause I want to take you back, oh, about two weeks.

Imagine if you had raised the issue, back in those good old days at your favorite breakfast counter over coffee and the morning newspaper, of the fairness of using the "butterfly ballot." What if you'd questioned the

legality of such a voting procedure, pointing out that the law in some states requires ballots be marked to the right of the candidates' names?

Perhaps you might have questioned the validity of counting "swinging chads" versus "dimpled chads."

Folks would have wondered what you were talking about. They'd have judged you crazy, shaken their heads and gone back to chit-chatting about People magazine's Sexiest Man Alive issue.

Suddenly, these are national issues, being debated in the courts, covered by the news, and evoking passionate protests and debate.

Ultimately, that's a good thing, according to Lansing pollster Ed Sarpolus. He contends that the result of the Florida recount in the presidential elections will be renewed interest on the part of the public in the political process.

State Senate Minority Leader John Cherry, D-Clio, is predicting the battle over ballots will make the integrity of the elections process a top issue in the coming year.

What we ought not overlook is that this

election raised a number of other questions about the integrity of elections here in Michigan.

Among them is the question of using public resources to influence the outcome of elections. The Secretary of State and a judge read the 1996 law prohibiting use of tax dollars to campaign for or against ballot issues and came to very different conclusions about what it meant. That alone shows the need for another look at the law.

Kids First! Yes! filed complaints against 17 school districts over the way they were putting out information about Proposal 1 and the Secretary of State concluded 12 violated the law. Huron Valley schools and several teachers unions filed suit to contest her view of the law, and Ingham County Circuit Court Judge Michael Harrison agree with them.

A key difference had to do with whether there is a requirement that the information put out by districts, using public resources, has to be balanced. Harrison was quite right that the law doesn't say that. The law says it has to be factual.

The Secretary of State has a fair point. In many elections in which local units, like school boards, put out information there is no organized opposition. So there ought to be some requirement for balance. The last thing I want to see is a local government using my tax dollars to convince voters to increase my taxes even more.

But the judge is right. The law doesn't say that. If that is what lawmakers wanted on the books, they need to go back and say that directly.

Another issue had to do with Proposal 2, the Let Local Votes Count initiative. The sponsor of the amendment was the Michigan Municipal League, which pumped \$521,000 in loans into the campaign. That's

legal. Michigan's previous Attorney General ruled the MML can put funds into campaigns like that.

There is still a question about whether it should be allowed. Much of the group's funding comes from municipalities and their taxpayer-supported budgets, paid to the MML through dues and fees. It's one step removed, but there is a case to be made that it is essentially using public resources to campaign for a ballot proposal.

If Lansing lawmakers want to stop that, they are going to have to specifically address it in law.

It is good to see that Americans do still care about elections and their votes, as we are seeing in Florida. But we should also view that as a lesson about why it is important for us to sort out the lingering questions about our elections processes here in Michigan. They do matter. And they'll matter more in some close election here in the future.


Investment Club and the Northville Township election committee.

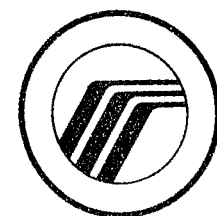

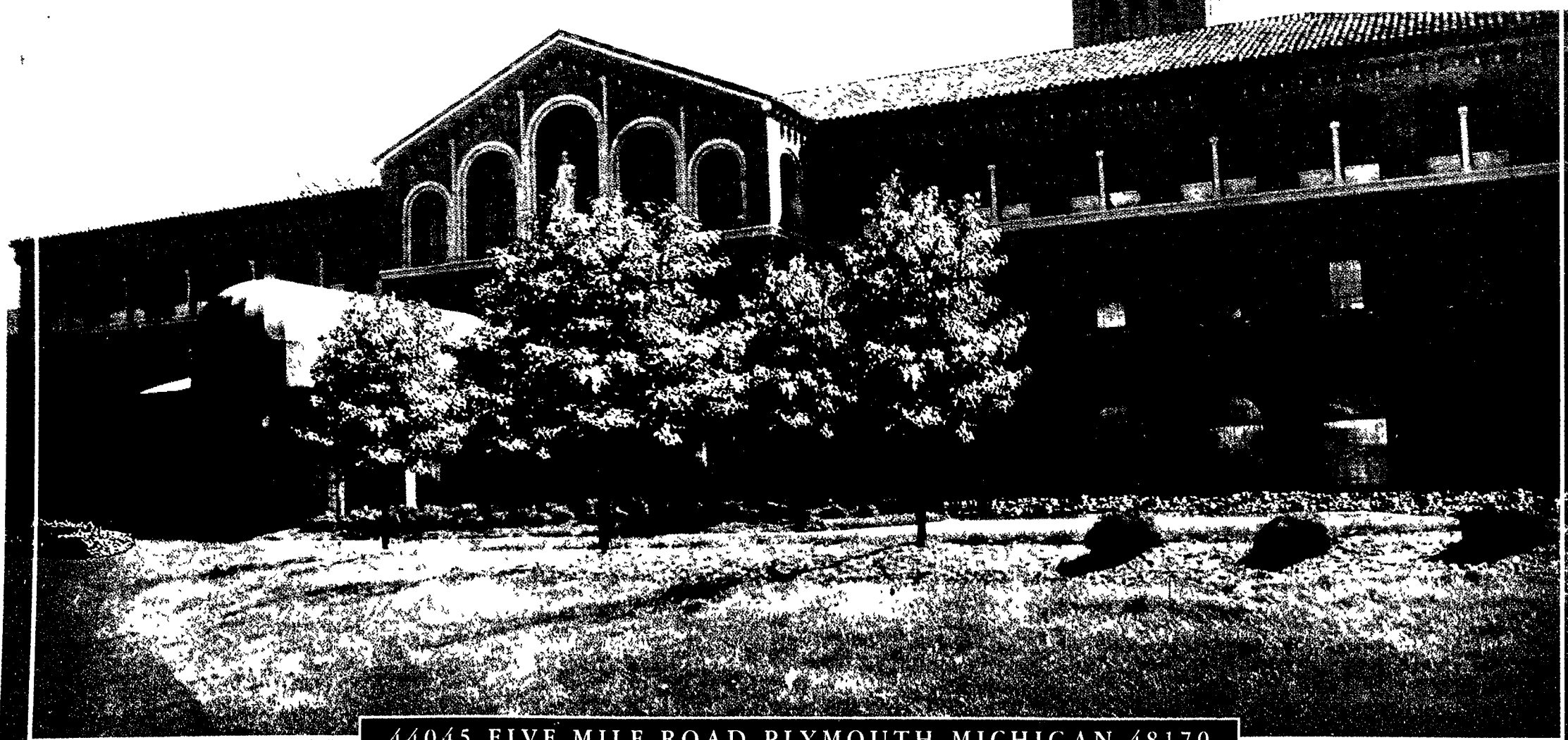
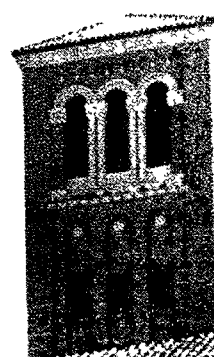

hiser shines with frosty blue flowers, silver and stars. Her sister, Margaret, designed one bearing a cardinal and red berries. Its stand is a birdhouse that is decorated with a tiny string of lights and a little wooden fence.

Morrow was inspired by the Woodward Dream Cruise in designing her tree, which bears classic Hot Wheels cars and stands in a large toy truck. Considering this a tree for boys, she also fashioned one for girls that features little Barbie dolls and jewelry among its ornaments.

Troy Marriott staffers are among the businesses, college culinary departments and individuals contributing part of this year's gingerbread village.

Chef Jack Delby and second cooks John Travinier and Kethe Hampel have built a castle that measures about 2 feet square and features a tower. It is held together with icing and is completely edible, like others in the village.

"It will be totally assembled here (at the Marriott) and very carefully transported from point A to point B," Delby said.

Today the festival raises \$30,000 through the wreaths and \$150,000 through the tree sales and sponsorships. It grosses more than \$1 million. It donated \$640,000 in cash for the hospital last year.

Money raised for the Evergreen Endowment Fund totals more than \$8.6 million. Percentages are earmarked for hospital research.

Honorary chairpersons are Joe Dumars, president of basketball operations for the Detroit Pistons, and his wife, Debbie.

"Debbie and I are pleased to continue our seven-year association with Children's Hospital of Michigan helping to raise money for children," Dumars said.

"There's a special place in our hearts for helping children in need, and we welcome the opportunity to make this year's Festival of Trees the most successful event ever."

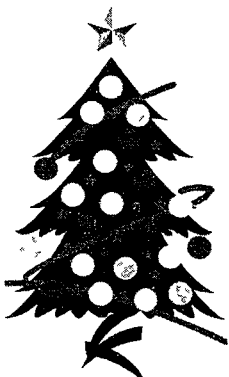

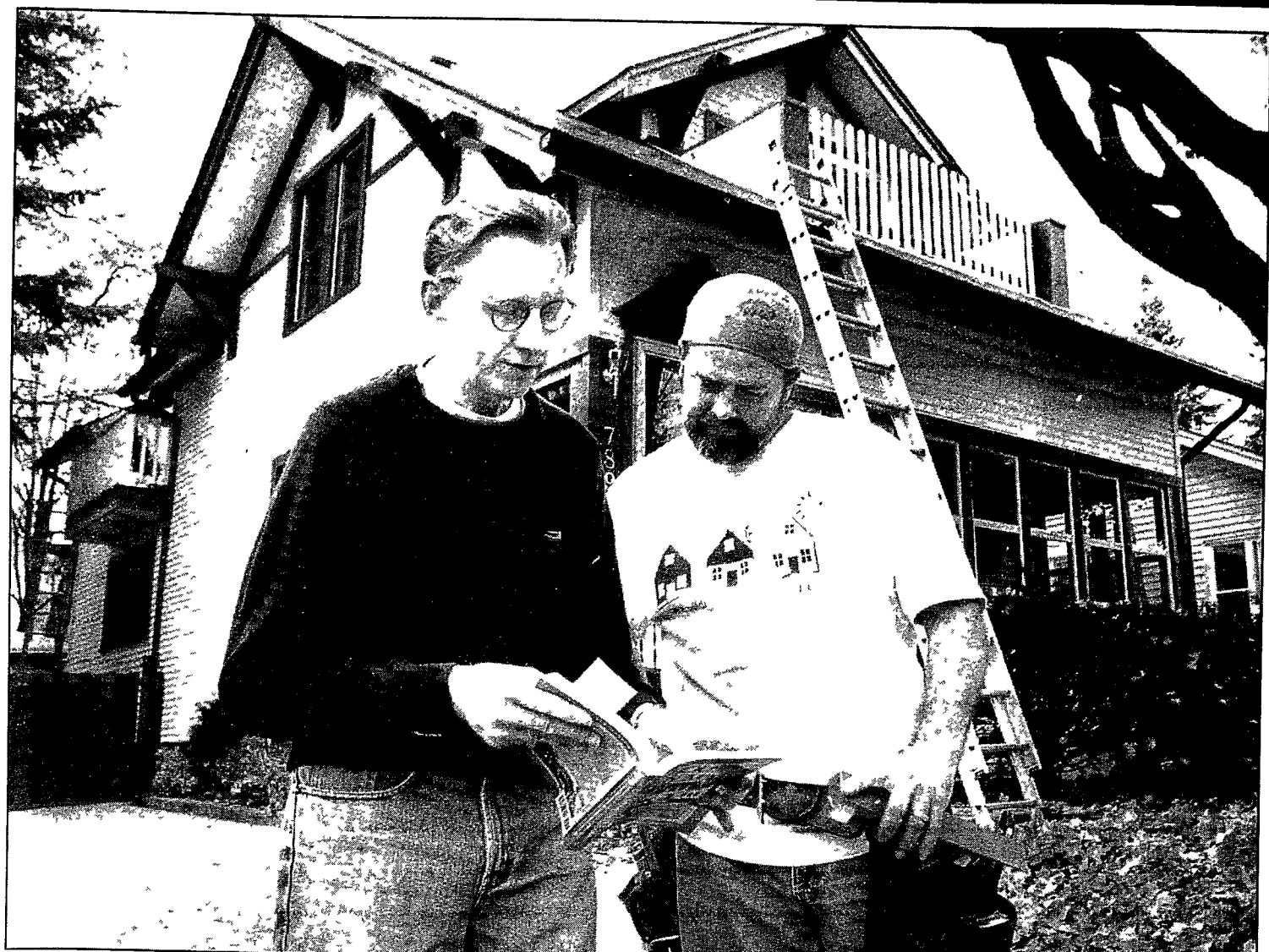

## Piecing it together

### Remodeling Sears kit homes a challenge

Take a look at Bruce Sole's home. Nice clapboard, right? Wrong. It isn't. It's siding, but it looks good enough to be clapboard.

So how does a home as old as Sole's get the kind of fancy corners and artistic cuts that you'd expect to find only in clapboard? The answer, Guy Jones and his business in Holly.

Sole's home at 789 Carpenter Street was originally built in 1920 as a Sears catalog "kit" home. At the time, Sears, Roebuck & Co. sold almost anything, including housing. Sole's home, known as "The Carlin," retailed for \$1,200 at the time.

The home went through a series of owners for its first 70 years. Over time, the property had deteriorated to the point where several neighbors had even hinted at the notion of knocking the house down, Sole said.

Enter Sole and his wife, Robin in 1988. Newly-married and in the market for real estate in the Northville area, the couple saw the Carpenter Street house in a real estate agent's listings.

"We wanted to see the house, but the agent said, 'No, you don't want to see that house,'" Sole said. "Robin really wanted to get in Northville, though, so we went."

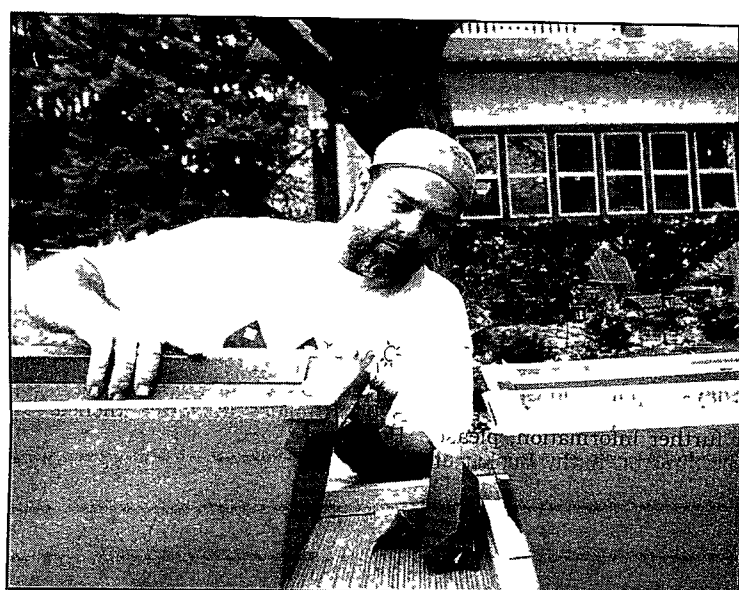
Admittedly, the home was in some pretty sorry shape, but Sole said his wife was sold on the front porch of the house. A few days later, they were owners, and renovations commenced.

Quickly, it became evident there was plenty to be done.

"Our first night inside, we'd been working all day and we just wanted to take a bath," Sole said. "We turned the water on and it came out just dirty, dirty water. We were so tired we took the bath, anyway."

Renovations eventually were completed and additions made to the home, Sole said. The home transformed itself from being in the wrecking ball on-deck circle into a property Sole genuinely loved. Last spring, however, the once-every-so-often task of painting the home (which Sole had redone in barnyard red) was cropping up.

The asking prices for painters was expensive, and a finite fix, at that. Siding companies that were looked into couldn't come up with a

way of allowing the home's knee braces to remain exposed.

Then Sole noticed a siding job being done at a house a few doors down from his. It was exquisite, he said, and he asked for the telephone number and name of the contractor.

It was Guy Jones, a Holly resident.

Jones came to the site and listened carefully, Sole said.

"The biggest thing for me were those knee braces," he said. "I really wanted to be able to keep those. They're a unique feature on a house."

Convinced that Jones was the man for the job, Sole signed on the bottom line, and in early August, the job commenced.

"He was just unbelievable," Sole said. "It's incredible work. Unless you know this is siding, you'd swear it was paint."

Sole said Jones used special tools and knowledge of bending metal to create the cuts and angles evident on the house. Asking frequently for input, there wasn't a request made that couldn't be honored, Sole said.

"He was always asking me about how things looked and if I was satisfied," he said. "It was really something watching everything come together the way that it did."

Jones said he learned the craft from an early age. At first, he was doing the job for only a few dollars each hour, but gradually taught himself the craft.

"It's just something I really enjoy doing," he said.

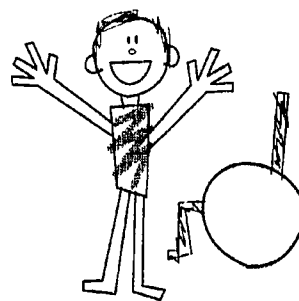
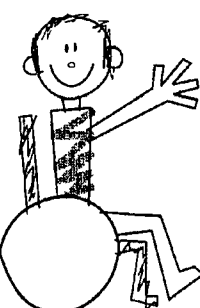

## Vertical Limit climbs up the earth's icy edge

An edge-of-your-seat, emotionally-charged action adventure story, *Vertical Limit* is a high-adrenaline tale of young climber Peter Garrett (Chris O'Donnell) who must launch a treacherous and extraordinary rescue effort up K2, the world's second highest peak. Confronting both his own limitations and the awesome power of nature's uncontrollable elements, Peter risks his life to save his sister, Annie (Robin Tunney), and her summit team (Bill Paxton and Nicholas Lea) in a race against time.

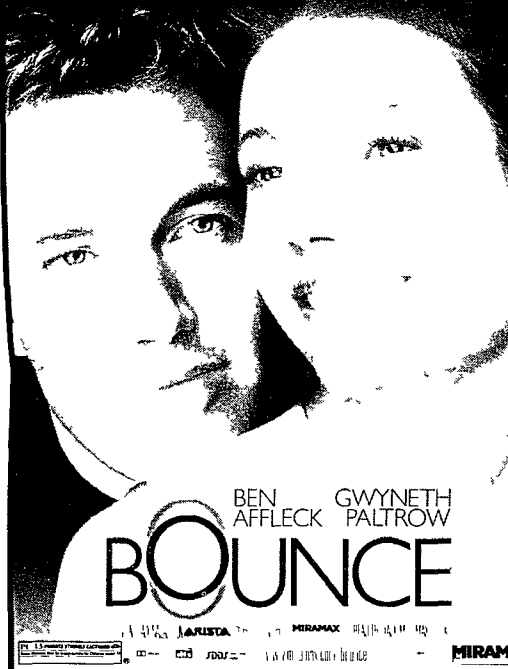

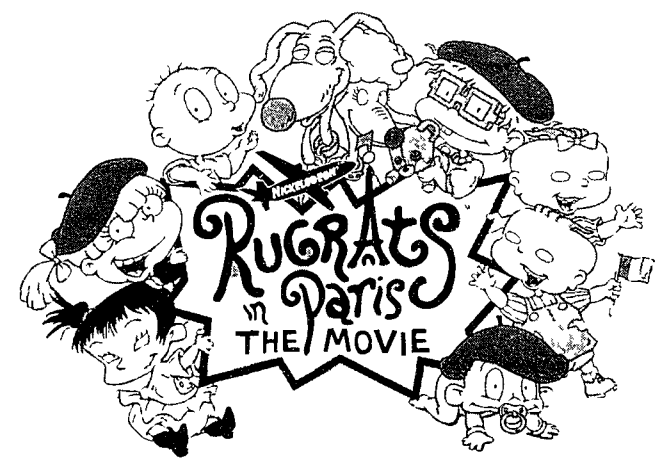

## Eagles run over 'Stangs

Power run attack overwhelms Northville for 21-14 win

For eight games, Northville's been able to use its size to overpower its opponents, pushing them out of the way and creating holes for backs Brandon Langston and Ryan Anolick.

But Saturday night Hudsonville gave Northville a taste of its own medicine, dominating the line of scrimmage en route to a 21-14 regional final victory which sent the Eagles to the Division II state semifinals this Saturday at Central Michigan University.

Hudsonville, which has won at least two playoff games in each of the last three seasons and reached the state finals in 1998, used a four-

back attack which wore on the Northville defense as the game went on.

"Our goal was to maintain possession of the football because they had the weapons to make big plays, like us," Northville coach Darrel Schumacher said. "What it boiled down to was they held onto the ball."

Luke Tanis led the Eagles with 98 yards on the ground, however coach Dave Duram switched his starting

backs up three times in the game. Tanis, regular starter Jeremy Underwood and Brandon Shuck were all featured backs at some point in the game.

But the difference in the game was Hudsonville quarterback Greg Immink, who hit tight end Tim Zweering for a 29-yard touchdown with 4:24 left in the game. Immink rolled out to his left and found a wide open Zweering crossing the middle of the field. The touchdown gave the Eagles their first lead of the game.

Northville came right back and moved the ball up the field, only to fall short as a Drew Herpich pass intended for Aaron Redden sailed wide.

"Our guys banded together (on the last drive) and moved the ball down the field," the coach said. "I felt (offensive coordinator) John Horwath made all the right calls. He mixed up our passing game and the kids responded. But you have to give credit to their defense."

The Mustangs led throughout the game, taking an early 7-0 lead on a 1-yard run by Langston just 1:11 into the contest. The play capped off a quick, four-play drive which was set up by a kickoff return by Anolick to the Hudsonville 48-yard line.

"I thought we got them too quick, too early," Schumacher said.

Northville was able to hold the Eagles off on their first possession thanks to an interception by Adam Dilley, but it didn't take long for Hudsonville's size to take its toll on the 'Stangs.

Fullback Jon Besselsen capped off a 12-play scoring drive with a 1-yard run less than two minutes into the second quarter. The drive was the first of five possessions of eight plays

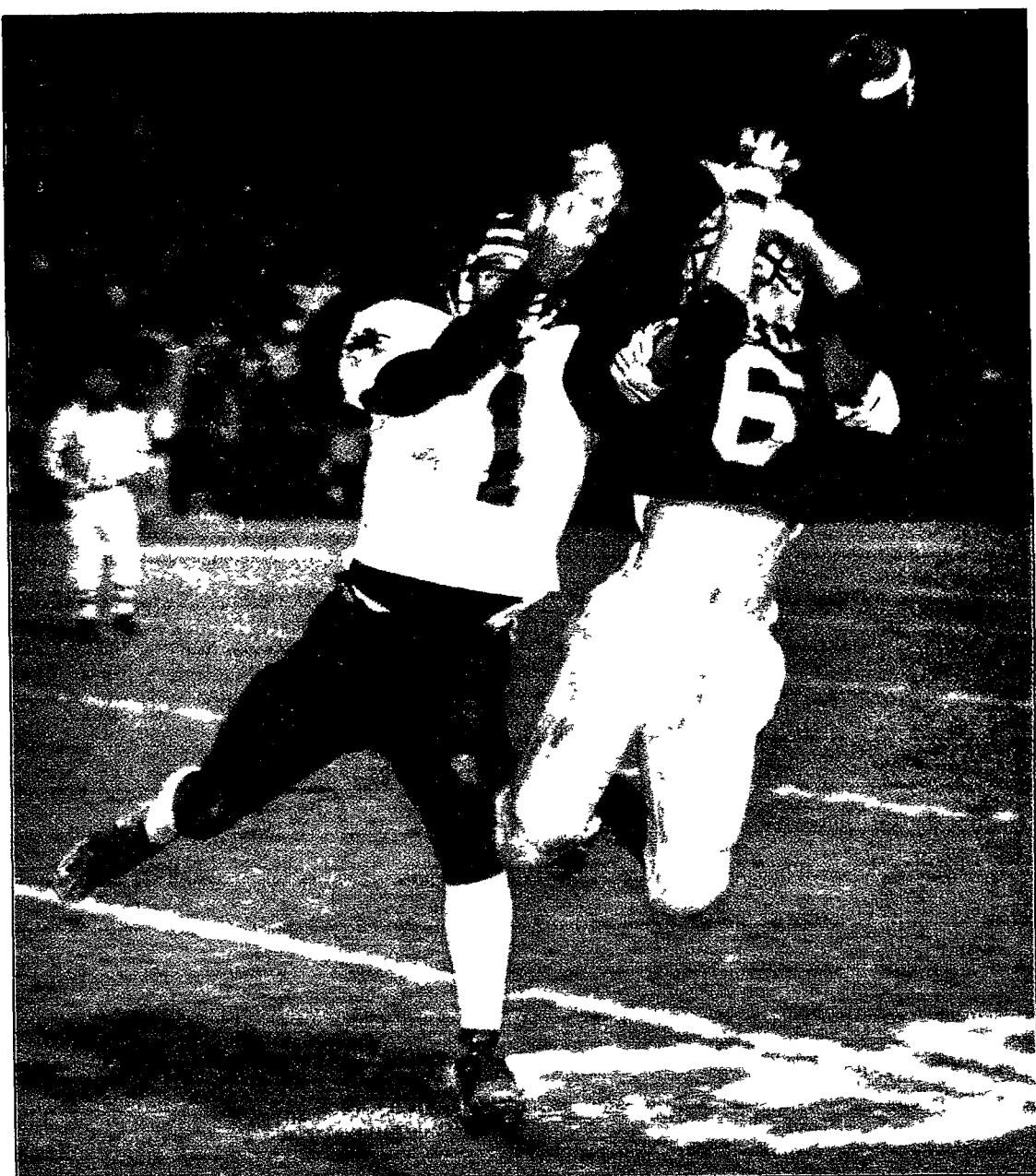

## Icers lace up skates for season opener tomorrow night

The fourth-year coach has his Northville team scheduled to play a very demanding schedule which consists of the usual Western Lakes' foes along with a very tough non-league agenda.

"He's not a big player, but he knows how to play hockey and he plays the position well," the coach said of his newcomer.

More experience returns to the third line as well. Junior Jason Wilchowski has battled back from injuries for his third year on the team. He'll center the line with Brandon Caverly on the rightside and Brandon Szatkowski on the left.

Caverly played on the team as a sophomore, but left to play travel hockey a season ago. Szatkowski is another third-year player. O'Neill has back.

Senior Brett Cheaney, junior Adam Zobl and sophomore Mike Fill provide O'Neill with additional depth up front.

Northville's experienced lineup continues back on the blue line as well.

Senior Aaron Selwood heads a veteran crew as one of the team's two assistant captains. Mike Stewart is the other assistant captain. Adam Dilley and Scott Weyandt give the team four top-notch defensemen. It'll need with two rookie goaltenders playing behind them.

"We have a nice mix back there," the coach said. "We've got some good sized guys and that will be the key for us this year."

Selwood, Dilley and Weyandt all stand more than six-feet tall and Stewart is nearly 5-feet-10.

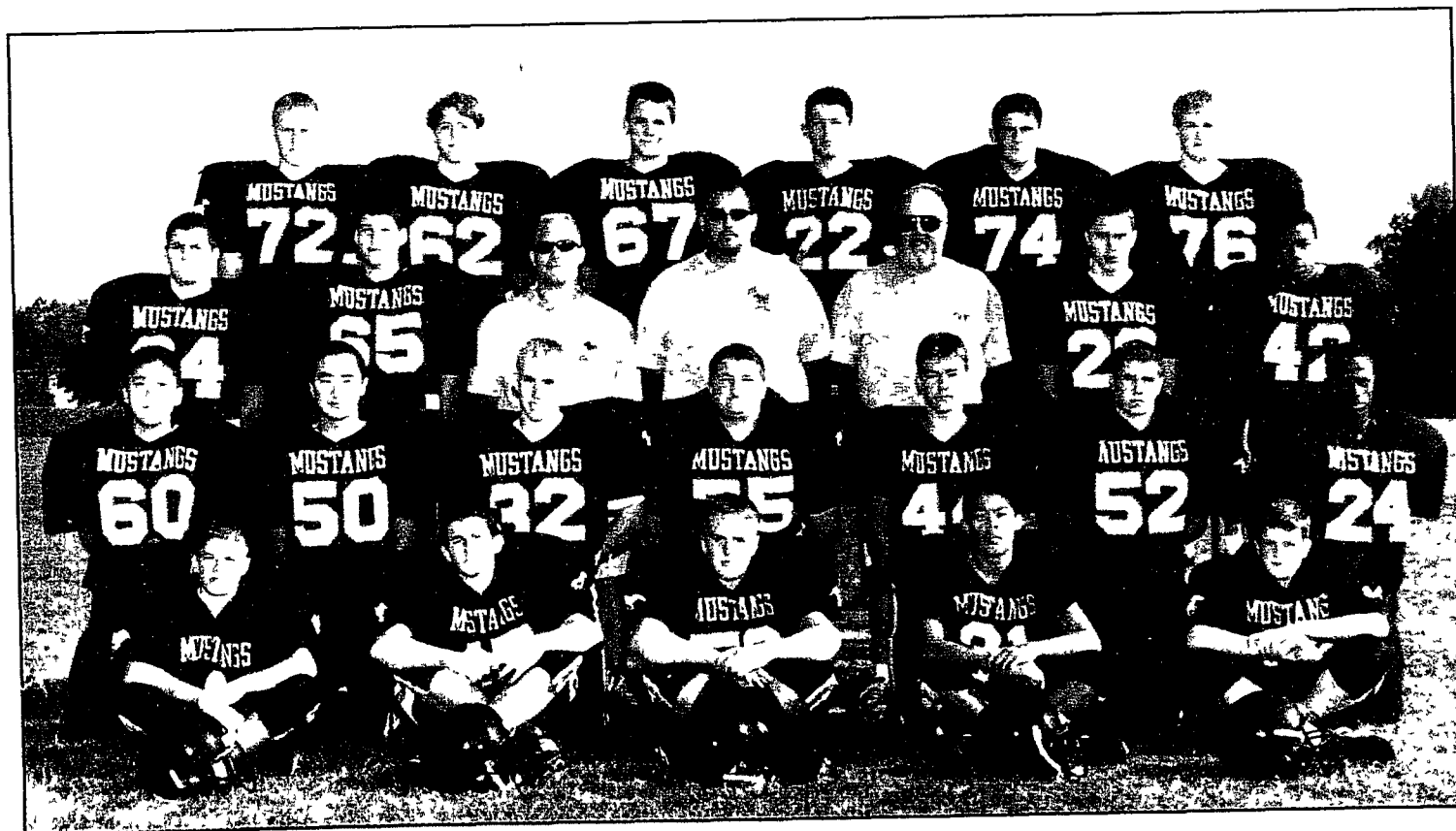
Junior Jeff Mnich is a 5-7, 140-pound defenseman, who along with Rob Ward (5-7, 130) will provide additional depth on defense.

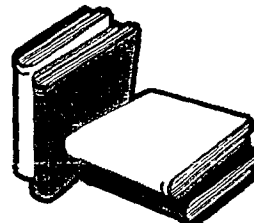

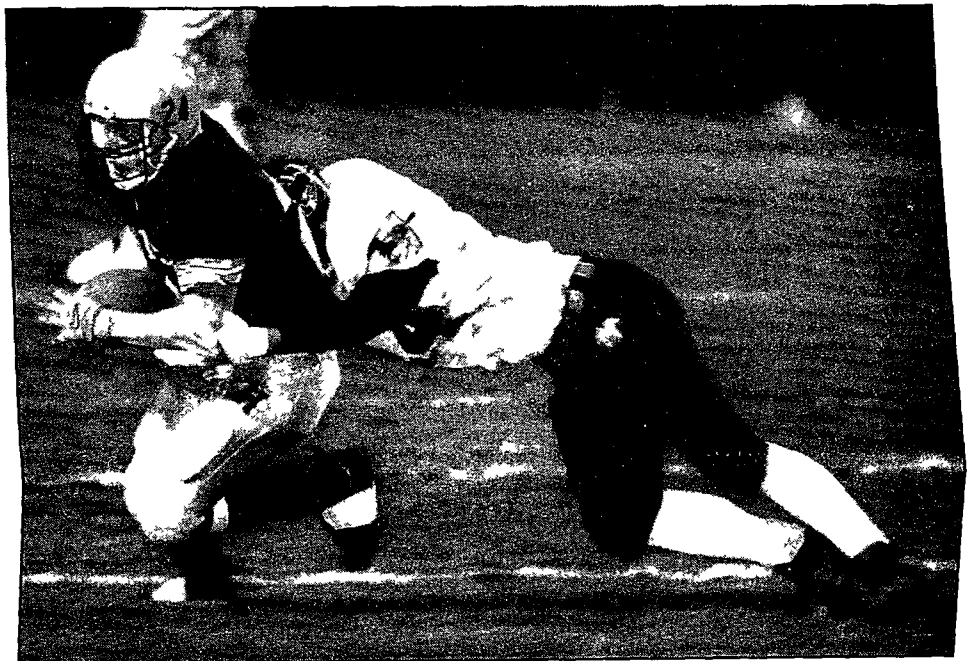
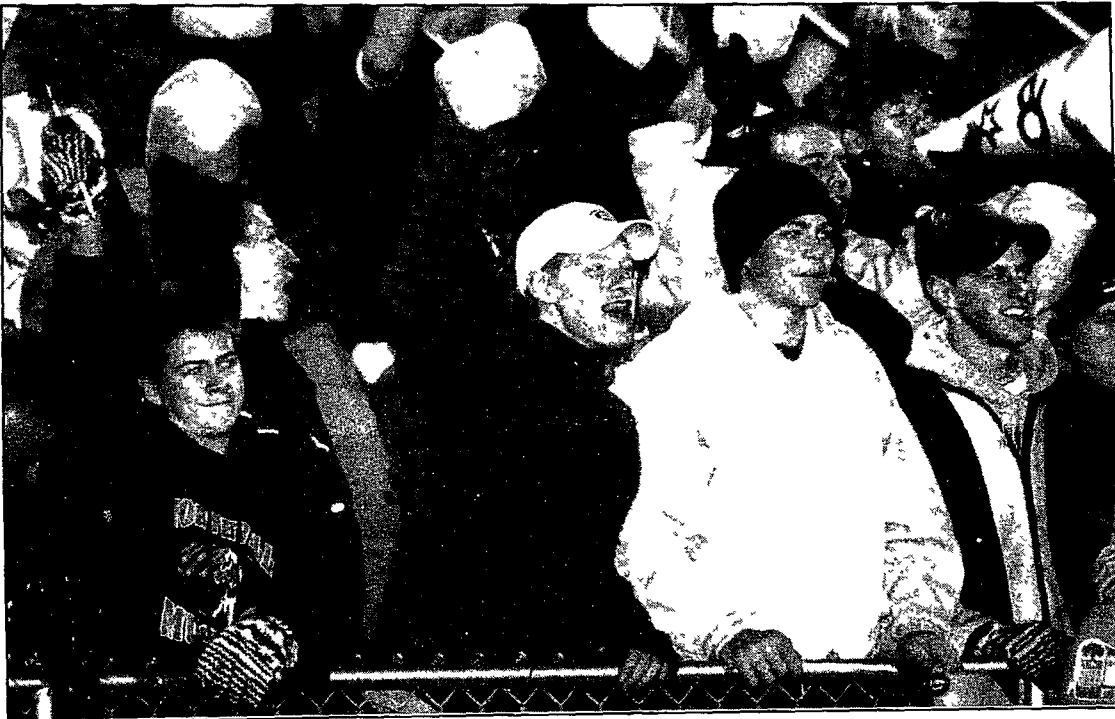

## Make exercise a priority in life

Let's be realistic. Due to today's busy lifestyle it is a challenge to consistently arrange time for exercise. Maybe you have heard the old saying, "It is not one giant step that gets you to your goals, but a series of small steps." Taking responsibility for your health and quality of life is vital. Making exercise a priority, as important as any other task of the week, is key. But in your constant effort to establish and maintain these larger lifestyle changes, don't exclude the small steps that will keep your heart pumping, metabolism going, stress relieved, and muscles working. Here are ten small steps you can add to your current schedule beginning tomorrow.

- Stretch for a few minutes in the morning. Two to three simple stretches for 10-15 seconds each will jump start your metabolism and warm up your muscles for the busy day ahead. Start with easy stretches such as reaching as high as you can with both arms and holding for a slow count of ten. Reach down with both arms bending at the waist and holding for a count of ten. Be sure not to bounce, and stay in control of the stretch.

- Check your posture at your desk. Instead of hunching forward, learn to sit back in your chair. Make sure you are looking straight at your computer to keep your neck in alignment. Take a deep breath in your chest, hold your tummy tight and bring your shoulders up to your ear, hold for a count of three. Do this at least once per work hour.

- Take brief stretch breaks at your desk. A lot of the acute pain in the wrists, shoulders, neck and back that we experience can be avoided with daily stretching. Some easy desk stretches include:

- Easing neck tension: Extend your left arm in front of you, parallel to the floor. With your right hand, gently push your head down toward your left shoulder. Hold for a count of ten. Now do the other side. Tip your head forward and hold for another ten count.

- Cradle each arm: Bring right arm across your chest as though you are cradling a baby. Hold left hand at right elbow and push elbow gently toward you. Hold for a count of ten and do the same on the opposite side.

- Stretch upper back: Bring right arm up over your right shoulder. Bend it at the elbow and hold. Take left hand and push elbow toward your back. Feel the stretch in your upper body.

- Carry your bags when shopping. Instead of using a cart, locker, or dropping the bags off at the car, try carrying them. This will increase the amount of weight bearing activities you complete.

- Tighten your muscles in your mid-section or bottom at every stop sign or red light. If you think about all of the time you spend

stopped at a red light or stop sign during the course of the day, it adds up to a great little workout. Just condition yourself to tighten your mid- or bottom-section muscles while breathing normally, until the light changes or you start to move again.

- Take the stairs instead of the elevator or escalator whenever possible. Climbing stairs not only raises your heart rate, it is a great exercise for your legs.

- Grim your way to thin. Although this requires a bit more than a few smiles, research has found that laughing 100 times is physiologically equivalent to exercising on a rowing machine for ten minutes.

- Park further away from the door. Consider how many times you drive around the parking lot looking for a closer spot. Use that time more wisely. Park further away and give your body a little workout.

- Take a short walk after each meal. Your body's energy level decreases slightly after eating due to increased energy necessary for digestion. Take a five-minute walk after a meal to give your energy levels a little boost.

- Do what you can for a more formal exercise program. The time will never be exactly perfect to start that exercise program. Do what you can, some is better than none.

Add these ten small steps to your daily routine and watch them add up to big results. Good luck.

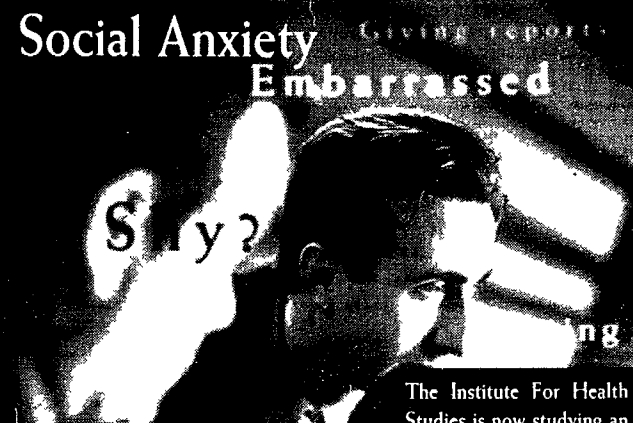

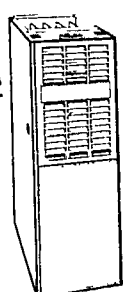

# A Home from Habitat

Volunteers help  
build new home for  
growing Fowlerville family

She was sure no one would come. The first day Sandra and Joe Becker hoped to put the walls up for their "Habitat for Humanity" home, there was a snowstorm. And although it was April 8th, it was bitter cold. She was doubtful that volunteers would be willing to work in that kind of weather.

"It was a blizzard. It was the coldest day. I didn't think anyone would be there to volunteer. When we got there, there must have been 50-60 people," said Sandra Becker. "It was chilly for two to three days after. It was funny, I didn't think they'd hang around...but they did."

But they did show up. Many of the local volunteers came from Circle 12, a group of 12 churches in Livingston County who provided elbow grease as well as a bite to eat. They were critical to the success of the project.

Joe Becker also contributed much of his own labor to help cut expenses. The manual labor didn't bother him; in fact, he found the experience of working on his own home satisfying.

"I'm pretty handy. I've been around construction

trades for a while," he explained.

Several months later Sandra and Joe Becker, their three children moved into their new home, a modest three bedroom ranch of about 11000 square feet in Fowlerville. For Joe Becker, it's a dream come true.

"We're finally able to own a house instead of renting one, like we did for the last 14 years. It's satisfying to actually have a home of our own," he said.

The couple enjoys the open floor plan, where the family room, kitchen and dining room flow together.

"It's an open area, it's where we spend most of our family time together," he said.

Although there are always things a homeowner wants to add or change, Sandra Becker is mostly just plain grateful for her new home in an area that she loves.

The Beckers wanted to move for lots of reasons. A family with three growing children, they needed more space. So when Sandra's neighbor pointed out an ad for Habitat for Humanity, she decided to give it a chance and filled out the application.

She was surprised when about a month later,

Habitat for Humanity informed them that they qualified for the project. At the time, Habitat was able to purchase three acres in Fowlerville on which they built three homes. The Beckers chose from three available house plans that the program offered.

Homes for Habitat for Humanity usually take approximately four to six months to build. Sometimes there are waits for property, since it's becoming more and more scarce, notes Terri Best, Executive Director of Livingston County Habitat for Humanity. In the Becker's case, property was quickly available. With the volunteer labor and some donated items, the cost of the home is approximately 25 per cent less than a traditional build. Most importantly, is the interest they save on the loan. The mortgage is based on the cost of the house only with not interest for the life of the loan.

The organization aims to build about three homes per year. The Becker's project was sponsored by the Circle of 12 church groups.

"I feel it goes much further than the house. It's the whole process of getting the community together and

helping a family that wants to help themselves. It's not a handout," said Best.

The general guidelines to qualify for a Habitat for Humanity Home is that the family income must be less than half of the county median, which is approximately \$62,000 in Livingston County. Other factors include the size of family, could adjust those figures.

The applicant must show sufficient credit history to support a mortgage.

The last factor, the most difficult to determine, according to Best, is to prove a housing need. This can include space, safety of inadequate or deplorable conditions.

Volunteers and donations may contact the above number as well. The group is also looking for people interested in serving on their Board of Directors as well.

# Flow blue platter is worth green

**Q.** Enclosed is a photo of a porcelain platter given to me years ago. It is in perfect condition. Marked on the back is a crown above a circle. Inside the circle are the words "Meissen - England." Any information would be greatly appreciated as to how old it is and its value.

A Your platter is an example of flow blue china. Porcelain, stoneware or semiporcelain that is decorated with blue under glazed designs that have a blurred appearance are referred to as flow blue. The blue decoration flows onto the white background during the firing process. Meissen is the name of the pattern. The pattern was inspired by the onion or bulb pattern made in the early 18th century by the Meissen factory in Germany. Although the mark you described is often seen on china it has never been attributed to a specific manufacturer.

Your platter was made in England after 1891 and would probably be worth about \$300 to \$400.



**Q.** This mark is on each piece of a service-for-12 set of china that was given to me by my aunt. She received the dishes as a wedding gift in 1925. The pattern is Pasade-

na, and each dish is decorated with multicolored floral sprays against a white background.

**I** would like to know the value, if any, of the china.

A Theodore Haviland and Co. has made porcelain from 1892 to the present. The company is located in New York. This mark was first used in 1937.

Your circa-1937 dinnerware set would probably be worth about \$600 to \$1,000.

**Q.** My mother-in-law gave me a glass vase for my wedding shower more than 50 years ago. It is tall and slender with a bun-shaped base. It is decorated with a chartreuse floral design on a textured frosted background. Marked on the bottom of the vase are the words "Val St. Lambert." I would appreciate whatever you can tell me about my vase.

A Val St. Lambert Crystalleries has produced high-quality glass in Belgium from the 1930s to the present. The glass works was founded circa 1800 and has been located in France, the Netherlands and Belgium.

Your vase would probably be worth about \$200 to \$400.

**Q.** I have a pine pie safe that has been in my family since the middle 1800s. It stands about 48 inches tall and has short square legs. There are two doors on the front, and each has three pierced tin panels. Also on each end, there are three

pierced panels. All of the panels have the same sunburst design. Could you please tell me what its value is?

A Pie safes or pantry safes were made for keeping pastries and other foods safe from bugs and mice. Most of the leading manufacturers were located in the Midwest.

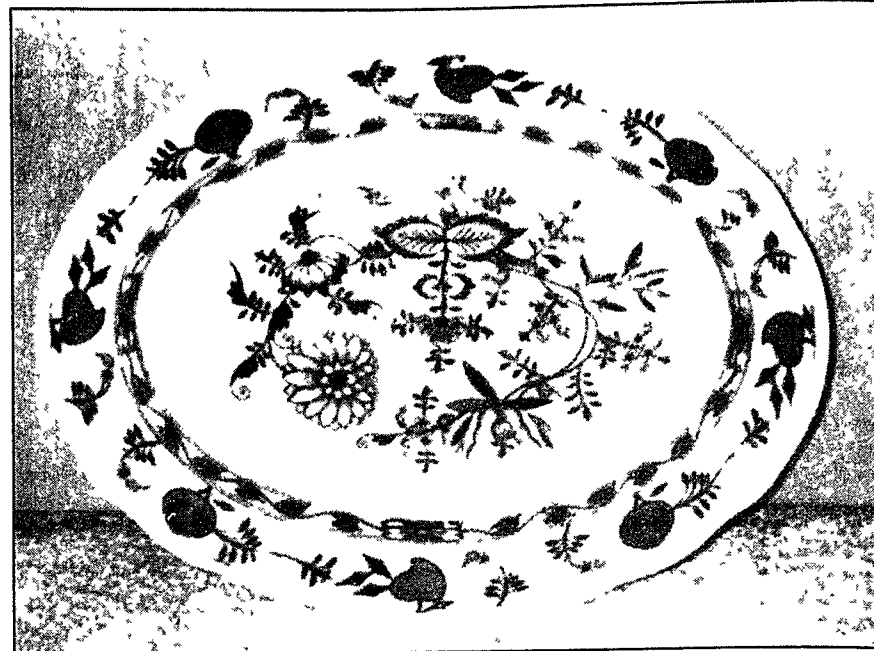
Your circa-1850 pie safe would probably be worth about \$1,500 to \$2,000.

**Q.** I have an earthenware pitcher that I inherited. On the bottom is the word "Monmouth" inside a triangle. I know it is very old, but there is no date on it. The pitcher is decorated with the profile of an American Indian, teepees and trees in cobalt blue against a cream background. It holds one quart and is in perfect condition.

Do you have any idea of the age, background and value of my pitcher?

A If you take another look at your pitcher, you will find the man on it has a half-closed eye. You have an Old Sleepy Eye pitcher. Old Sleepy, a town in Minnesota, as well as the local flour mill and stoneware pitchers with his image, were named for Sleepy Eye, a Lower Sisseton Sioux chief who had a droopy eyelid. He was a well-known chief and his tribe inhabited that area.

In the early 1900s Weir Pottery Co. made gray and cobalt stoneware decorated with Old Sleepy Eye's likeness for Sleepy Eye Milling Co., which sold directly to the con-



sumer and gave away stoneware premiums. Western Stoneware Co. of Monmouth, Ill., bought out the Weir Pottery in 1906. Most blue and white pieces were made in the late 1930s and were not given as premiums. Collectors should keep their eye open for recent reproductions.

Your pitcher would probably be worth about \$225 to \$325.

## BOOK REVIEW

This well-documented guide clearly shows the significance of the mark Jack Carnes made on art pottery.

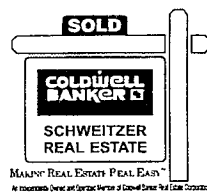

# Coke girls are ad classics

For collectors of advertising art, Coke is it. From the beginnings of The Coca-Cola Co. in 1886 until its rapid emergence as the best-known commercial beverage - which coincided with the rise of the soda fountain - and beyond, a great emphasis has been put on print and other advertising, to the point where the history of Coca-Cola ads is virtually a history of American graphic art and advertising content and style.

Several people contributed to establishing the iconic Coca-Cola mystique. The drink itself was concocted by an Atlanta wholesale druggist and chemist named John Stith Pemberton, who patented and promoted it as French Wine of Coca. Pemberton convinced Willis Venable, proprietor of the soda fountain at Jacobs Pharmacy, to mix carbonated water with his caramel-colored syrup blend.

The name Coca-Cola was suggested by Pemberton's bookkeeper, Frank M. Robinson (based on the two main ingredients - the South American coca leaf and the African cola nut), who also drew the flowing Spencerian script logo. Alex Samuelson, a worker at the Root Glass Co. bottling plant, designed the classic Coke bottle, inspired by the shape of a cola nut. Equally important was Asa G. Chandler, who refined and improved the original formula and aggressively marketed the product when he took over the company.

Almost from the very outset, the firm employed feminine charms to promote its product - in magazines and on billboards and signs, store displays, fans, calendars, thermometers and trays. A handsome and informative new large-format book, "Coca-Cola Girls, An Advertising Art History" by Chris H. Beyer (Collectors Press), the first art book Coca-Cola has licensed for publication, offers abundant evidence of the girls' cultural resonance, variety and exemplary commercial art qualities.

There were prim and pensive Victorian young ladies, many of them fashioned after two then-prominent actress-singers named Hilda Clark and Lilian Nordica. In 1914, there was a popular dark-

haired model known only as Betty. There were girls driving early automobiles and girls, fully dressed, on the beach. The 1920s girls were more daring, seen in knee-baring swimsuits and bobbed hair. In ensuing decades, movie stars such as Jean Harlow and Joan Crawford were used. Then there were numerous World War II girls in uniform and athletic girls next door into the '60s.

Although many well-known illustrators were employed by Coca-Cola - from N.C. Wyeth to Norman Rockwell to Alberto Vargas, George Petty and Earl Moran - two names stand out.

Haddon Sundblom, a successful commercial artist (he designed both the Quaker Oats Man and Aunt Jemima images), created a plump and jolly image of Santa Claus for the firm in 1931, forever changing the American image of St. Nicholas, variations of which he produced every holiday season for the next 31 years. In addition, he did his share of fresh-faced, wholesome, smiling young women, often accompanied by a cute kitten or puppies.

Gil Elvgren was another artist who produced memorable Coca-Cola Girls. A one-time pin-up artist who was influenced and helped by Sundblom, Elvgren began working for Coca-Cola in the late '30s but is most known for the art he produced in the 1950s. Beyer singles out a few images that are particularly prized by collectors: a cardboard sign depicting a beautiful young woman in a white dress backed by a moonlit ocean, a girl in a cowboy hat, and a pretty blonde riding a colorful carousel horse.

Coca-Cola advertising material has long been collected, and the market for it is as strong as ever. From the recently published "Rinker Price Guide to Collectibles, Post-1920s Memorabilia" (House of Collectibles), here are a few items representing the higher end of the scale:

- A two-sided porcelain sign reading "Drink Coca-Cola/Pause Refresh/Lunch" from 1933 is worth \$3,850.

- One page of a 1928 distributor's calendar, depicting a lounging woman with spit-curl hair and long gold dress is worth \$850.

- A 1939 calendar showing a smiling girl pouring soda into a glass is worth \$525.

## Move your plants inside now to reduce shock of winter

**Q. I have a ficus tree that I have kept out all summer and have just brought it in for the winter. It is quite bushy and needs to be pruned. Should I wait until the spring or can I cut it down now?**

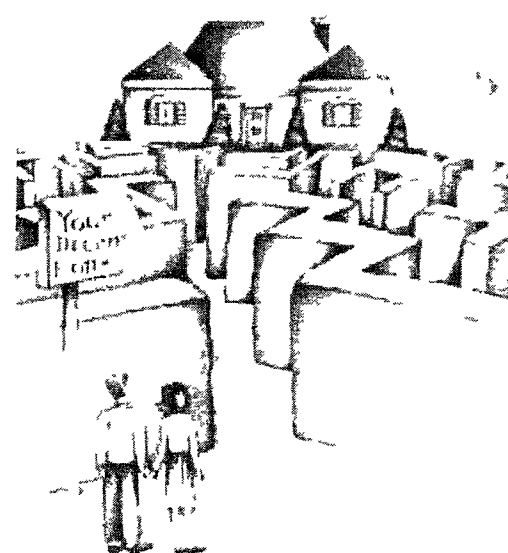
A. Houseplants that have been outside over the summer should be brought indoors during the few weeks that the outdoor temperature matches the indoor temperature. This is the time when you don't have the air conditioner or furnace on. Moving plants at this time will reduce the shock. Try to give the plants similar lighting conditions indoors that they had over the summer.

Check the plant and pot for bugs and worms before bringing them inside. Check inside the pot's drainage hole by pulling the plant out of the pot. If necessary, drench the soil with an insecticide before bringing the plant inside. Next summer, use clay pot feet to elevate the pots so pests won't get in.

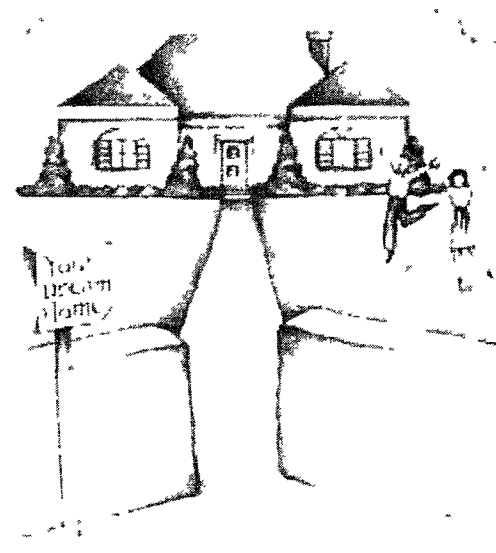
The leaves of plants develop differently according to the climate conditions they mature in. If it is bright and sunny, they will be thicker and have more wax on the surface than if they are in the shade. When the conditions change, the leaves may be rejected by the plant and new leaves better suited for the new conditions will grow. Ficus tree leaves are especially sensitive to these changes.

I would expect your tree to loose many leaves and small branches in a few weeks. I would wait until this happens to see which branches resprout new leaves and do any pruning necessary after that has occurred.

## DEVELOPER OF THE MONTH

By Steve Stein

One look at the new Mount Christie Estates residential development and it becomes quite obvious why there is nothing like it in Michigan.

Nestled in the site of a former ski area on one of the highest points of land in Southeastern Michigan, Mount Christie Estates offers all the amenities of country living within a short drive of many suburban conveniences in northern Oakland County.

The development is located in Metamora Township, known for its natural beauty, large estates, Victorian architecture, traditional values and the thou-

sands of century-old trees which form "leaf canopies" over country roads.

The huge glaciers which carved out the Great Lakes also created the rolling, hilly topography of the township and Mount Christie, at 1,300 feet one of the highest spots in Southeastern Michigan. It was the site of a popular ski area from the 1950s until the 1970s.

When it's complete, Mount Christie Estates will consist of 34 estate sites on 95 acres of scenic landscape that includes hills, heavily wooded ravines and Mount Christie itself, which overlooks a lake and rolling meadows.

Ron Lamparter, who bought the land in the mid-1980s and is developing it, said

the view from the top of Mount Christie, which now features a picnic area and observation gazebo, would make you swear you were in northern Michigan or Colorado.

"You can see for probably 50 miles," he said. "This is a very unusual piece of land. There's heavy timber, 150-year-old oak trees three feet in diameter, deep ravines strewn with boulders..."

Right now, Lamparter said, he's more in the marketing stage of the project. Only eight homes have been built with others under construction. Sites range from \$125,000 to \$250,000 and the houses themselves start at \$500,000.

The multi-level homes (2,800-square-



foot minimum) feature modern amenities like three-car garages, multiple fireplaces, outdoor decks and brick patios, but they also respect the warm character of the many turn-of-the-century homes located throughout the township.

"The sites range from one to two acres," Lamparter said. "We're leaving almost 50 acres of open ground. So, in essence, you could say you're buying one acre and getting 50 to enjoy."

There is no timetable for the completion of the project.

"That doesn't make a difference," Lamparter commented. "Our motivation isn't to sell quickly, but to build the finest quality we can possibly build."

Preserving the natural beauty of the area is an important part of Lamparter's plan. He notes in his literature that Mount Christie Estates homeowners will live in "scenic tranquility with deer, pheasants and other wildlife in their own backyards."

Metamora Township is also known for its large equestrian estates and that's why Mount Christie Estates has an equestrian theme. In fact, its logo includes a horse in full gallop. Membership and horse stalls in

the Equestrian Club at Mount Christie will be available to Mount Christie Estates residents with costs and the governing association separate from

the residential development.

The first portion of the Equestrian Club is complete and includes a barn with 11 stalls, a outdoor riding area, fenced

paddocks, a large fenced pasture and an extensive network of scenic riding trails. Phase II, subject to the approval of township officials, will include a swimming pool, tennis court and a large heated indoor riding arena.

Ironically, the first homeowners at Mount Christie Estates aren't horse owners but "they love horses," Lamparter said. "They love the idea of sitting down with their morning coffee and seeing horses prancing around the meadow."

Boating, fishing, swimming, skiing, golf and other recreational activities are nearby, adding to the desirability of the development.

Mount Christie Estates is 10 minutes away from the Great Lakes Crossing shopping mall, 20 minutes from places like The Palace, Pine Knob, Meadow Brook and DaimlerChrysler headquarters and 35 minutes from the Somerset Collection in Troy and downtown Birmingham.

The main traffic artery through Metamora Township is Lapeer Road (M-24), originally part of an old stagecoach trail which connected the towns and vil-

lages of Oakland and Lapeer counties. The Whitehorse Inn in the Village of Metamora was once a stagecoach stop.

Sites at Mount Christie Estates are list-

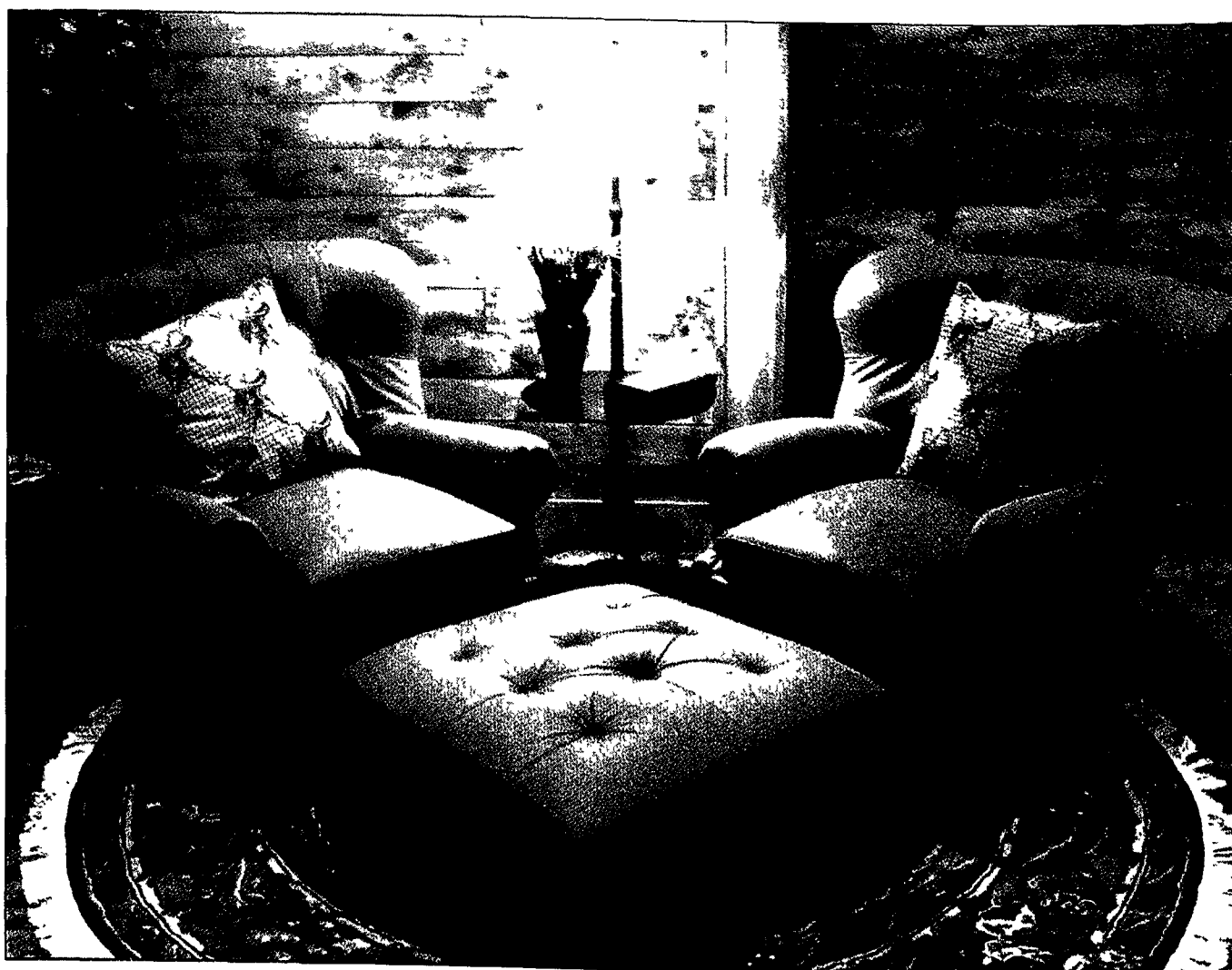

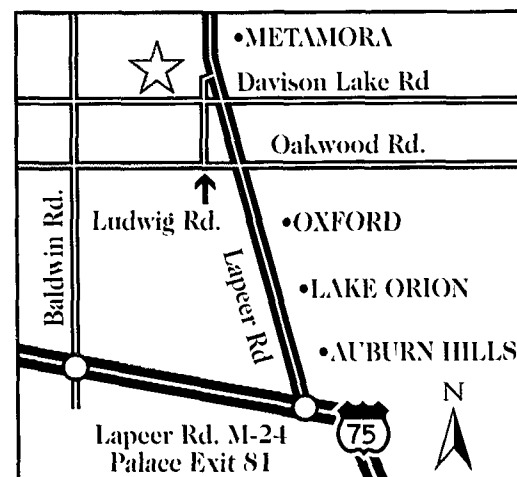

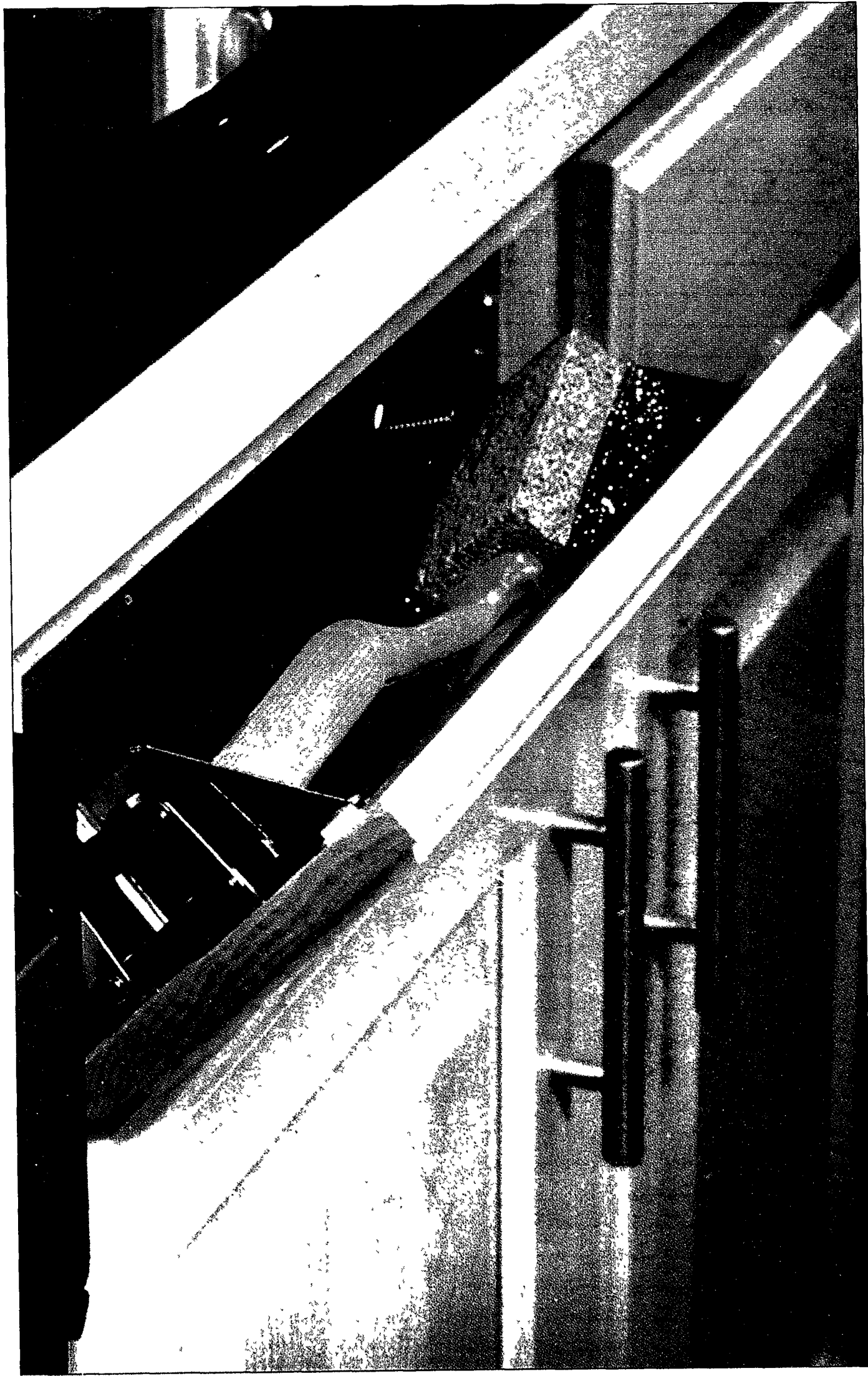

# Nooks for cooks:

## *Concepts in kitchen storage*



By Jeremy Hull

In the quest to provide a stylish and functional area in the home, nobody noticed the cook lying on the floor while trying to grab a pot nestled in the farthest corner of a base cabinet. And with the rise of bulk-item superstores that dole out thousand-count products, more and more homeowners are finding that function and form are applied to everything but the space underneath the kitchen sink. Designers are realizing that as their clients' dream kitchens grow in size, so have their storage needs.

"Generally, (kitchens) have gotten a lot larger," says Joe Luzyniski, president of Creative Designs Plus in Brighton. "They are becoming more spacious, and hence, (allow for) more storage areas. People are buying a lot more in bulk, so we're trying to accommodate those kinds of storage needs, especially for the larger families."

As larger amounts of product are being shoehorned into tighter spaces, so are the devices required to mix, brew, bake, grind, and toast all of them. Luzyniski says that there just is not enough room to hold all of the specialty appliances that have boomed in the past. He suggests installing an "appliance garage," which hides the appliance behind an enclosed, roll-down wood-panel, thereby lending a much cleaner look to the countertop.

"We'll put electrical outlets back there for the appliances, and it's a convenient area to keep these things that are everyday or every-other-day use, keep them plugged in and available," he says. "Yet when you want to clean the counter up when people are coming over, you just slide them back in a corner and shut the door."

Dan Alvey, owner of Kitchen Wholesale, Inc. in Farmington Hills, says that there is no shortage of storage items for the kitchen, as manufacturers are feeding the growing demand to fill every nook and cranny that homeowners can find. There is hardly anything in the kitchen that cannot be stowed away and made invisible when not in

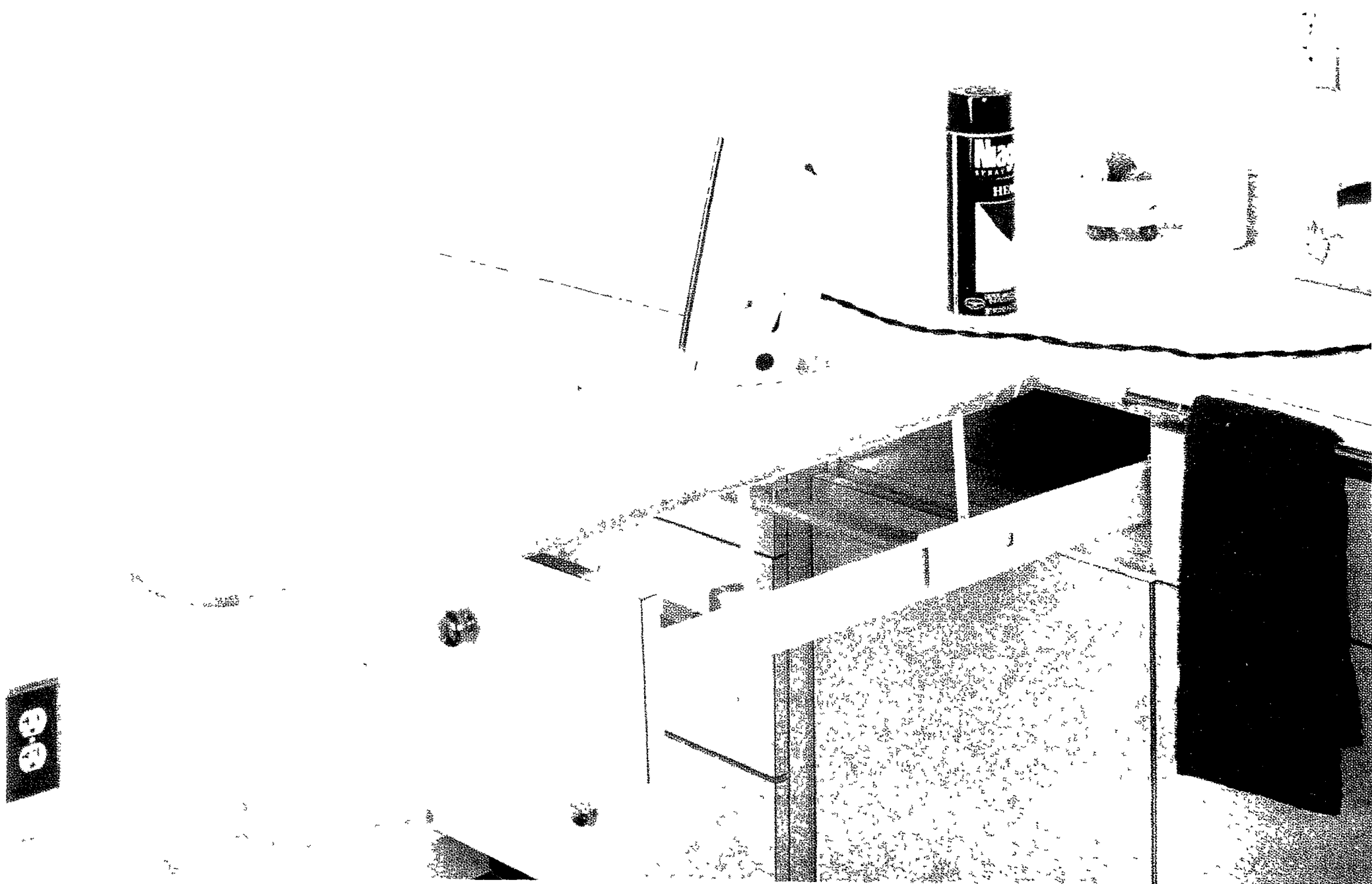
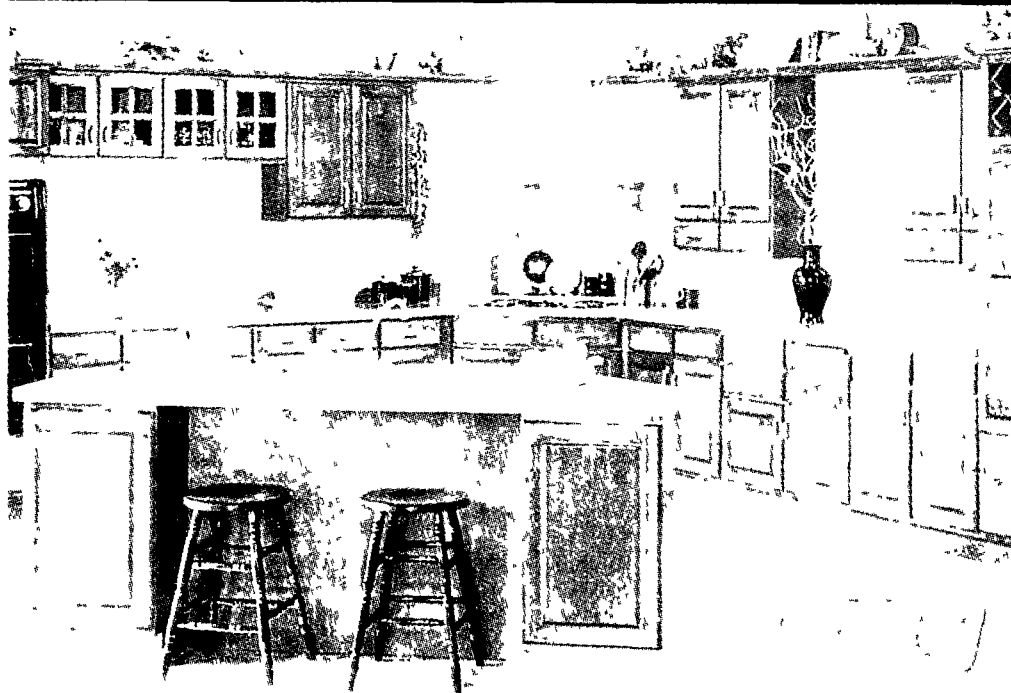

use, including:

- Appliance lifts combining fast storage with easy accessibility for labor-intensive cooks who rely on large, heavy mixers to practice their craft. The Haelele Appliance Lift features a spring-assisted platform that locks in the up position when needed, and locks down in a cabinet when not.
- Amerock spring-loaded drawers or pull-downs installed underneath a hanging cabinet for knife sets, cookbooks, message centers, or spice trays.
- An ironing board that folds easily into a drawer, known as the Rev-A-Board, and a line of slide-out or pivoting trash and recycling containers, called Rev-A-Shelf — all manufactured by Wesco.
- Plastic and stainless steel sink front trays that hold sponges and scouring pads, and are easily concealed in front of the sink, one of many storage solutions made by Knap & Vogt.

"It's amazing. People are asking for every storage feature that you see in the magazines," Alvey says. "Tip-out trays underneath the sink are almost standard equipment now. Rollout wastepaper baskets, rollout trays are almost standard equipment now. We hardly ever do a kitchen without them now."

Many storage solutions are created from the initial design stage. Jim Ethorne, president of E.W. Kitchens in Wixom, says that in the past, cabinetry was installed without much thought to where the homeowner would store pots and pans. Now, they are cutting out the guessing by designing specific cabinets for the storage of these cooking supplies. Rather than wasting a large amount of cabinet space with various stacked pots, many homeowners are installing drawers with sturdy suspension that can accommodate the burden.

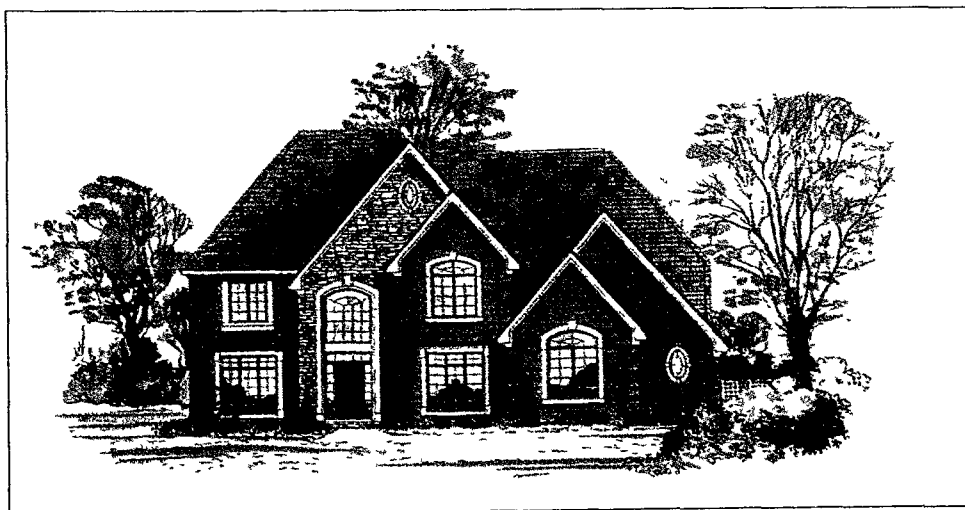
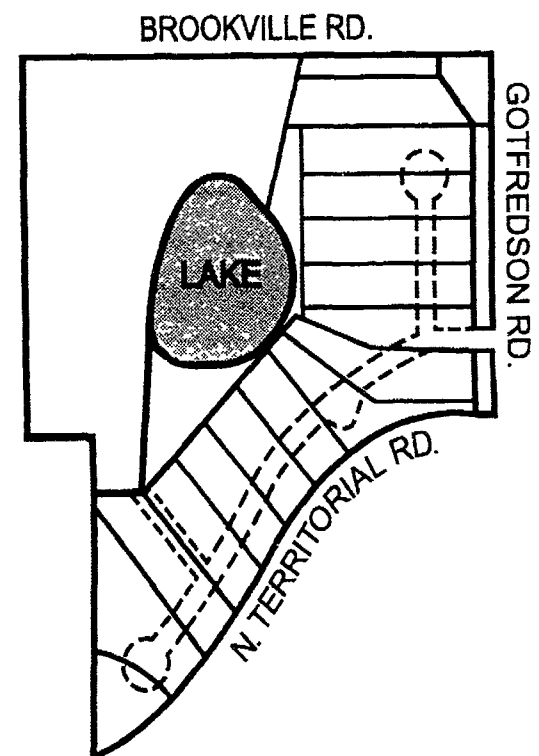

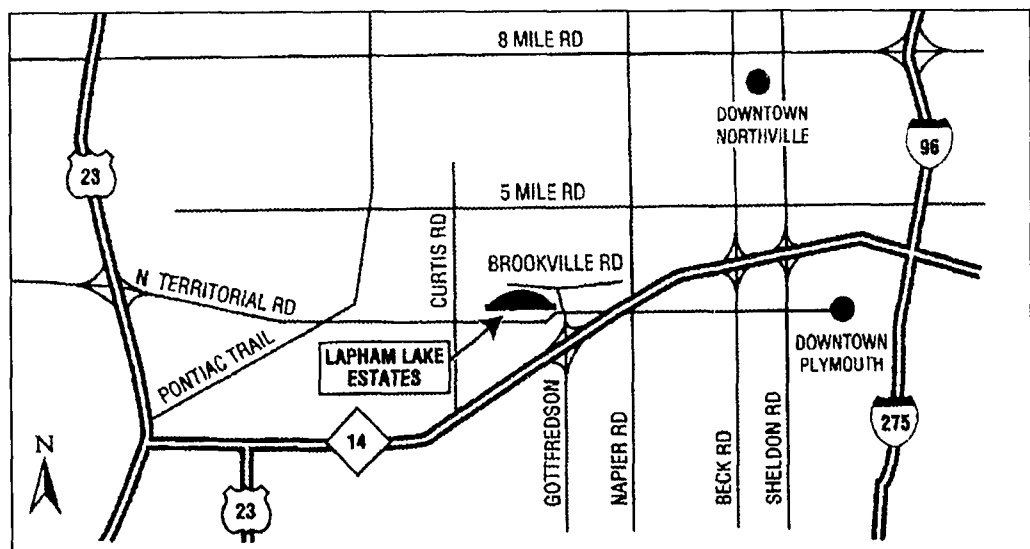

"There will be specific cabinets that will have stronger drawer suspensions, so the weight of a 3-quart weight cast iron stock pan will slide in and out of a drawer without it causing any duress," he says. "So, the cabinets around a cooking center will be stronger and able to hold a heavier pot and pan."

For cooks who want their storage centers to work a little harder for them, several companies have created chef's pantries that offer better accessibility to their supplies. StarMark has developed a pantry equipped with door shelving, rollout trays on top for food storage and underneath for pots and pans. Barbara Krol, co-owner of Grand Oaks Cabinet & Design Center in Howell, says that the StarMark pantry may organize everything somewhat better than a walk-in will.

"A walk-in pantry is nice, but it can get big, overwhelming and scattered," she says. "This kind keeps it a little more organized and compact."

Pioneer, Inc., a manufacturer of specialty cabinetry, has a unique twist on the chef's pantry by combining the spinning convenience of a lazy Susan with the deep space of



a walk-in. Standing 36 inches wide, 24 inches deep, and available in three different heights — 84, 90, and 96 inches — it is made from solid wood. Inside the pantry are three swiveling shelves that reduce the shuffling aside of boxes and cans to locate the right one. Steven Schwedt, owner and design consultant of LifeStyle Kitchens in Brighton, says that the Pioneer brand has an advantage since it is made from wood and

not particleboard, which is much heavier. It is now more stable, can handle more weight, and lets cooks simply spin and pick their choice of spices and cooking staples.

"Most walk-in pantries just have shelves, and this has the accessibility where you can pull it out and see it better," he says. "You can see what's in there instead of moving everything to one side." ■

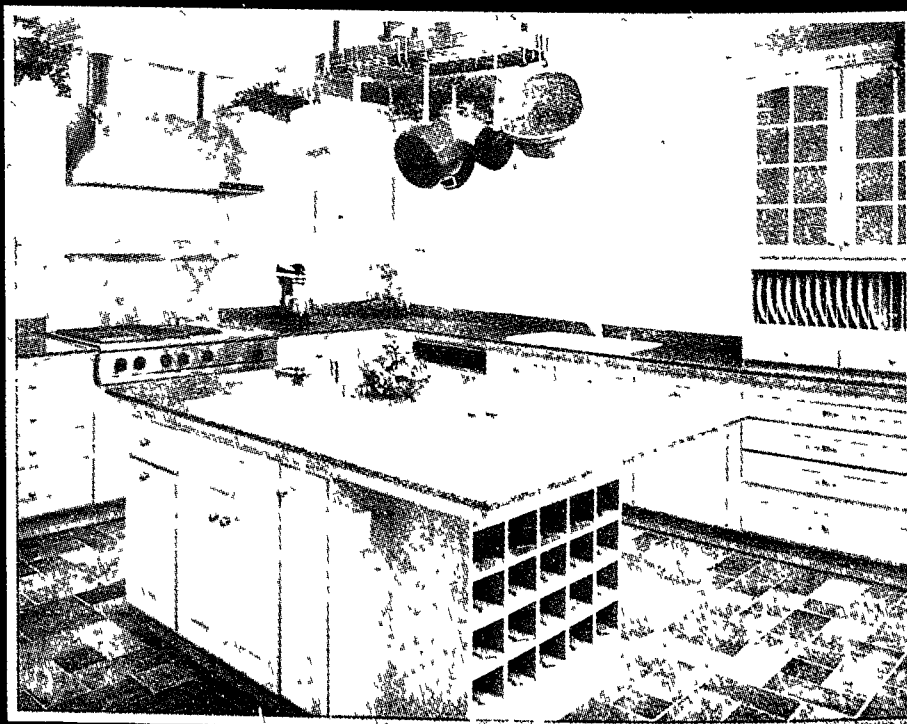

After a hard day at work, you head for your spa, lift the cover...Yuck! What's that smelly mess invading your little bit of heaven? Warm water is a perfect environment for growing algae, viruses and bacteria. If not properly treated, a spa can cause health problems and equipment problems. Keeping the water balanced and clean will increase the life of your spa and its equipment, and be healthier.

"You have to keep the water properly sanitized," said Lill McDonald of Portable Spas Plus in Novi and Sterling Heights, "and change the water frequently." Sanitizers, such as chlorine, bromine, or ozone, are used to kill bacteria in the water and keep the water smelling fresh. But always use products specifically made for spas.

"Ozone substantially eliminates the need for chemicals," said Jim McDonald. The initial cost of an ozonator may be more expensive, but it lasts from 2 to 5 years. Some chemicals are still needed, but the yearly cost is less. Chemicals accumulate in the water, requiring the tub to be drained. Ozone does not. This is good for people with allergies or who are sensitive to chemicals. McDonald said, "The job of the ozone is to kill what's in the water. The job of the filtration system is to clean what's in the water. The two have to work together, 50/50, to get crystal clear water."

Water circulates and flows through the cartridge. Any debris or gunk in the water is trapped in the filter. Clean water is then returned to the tub. A quick way to vacuum debris from the bottom of your spa is to use a garden hose and siphon it out.

Nature 2, an alternative to chlorine and bromine, is a silver cartridge that fits inside the filter. It has no chlorine smell and doesn't put a lot of chemicals into the water.

"Maintaining spas is much simpler and easier than in the past," said Tom Stratton, Lifestyle Hot Spring Spas with eight locations. "There



are more choices than ever before. The most popular is a liquid, 100 percent chlorine and bromine-free system, called Baqua Spa. No chlorine smell, no itchy skin, no red eyes, no faded suits, and no green hair. It's gentle on your skin and eyes, but it's a powerful sanitizer. Chemicals are good. They keep the water safe for you to use."

Jim Worful, Outdoor Ingenuities in Canton, suggests you "try to shower before tubing. Rinse off any make-up, hair spray, deodorant, and body oil, and use one bathing suit for the tub but don't wash it as often. This will help maintain the life of the water. Soap stays in the fabric and then gets into the water. Those are two little things, but they will make a big difference in the water."

Before you get in the tub, check the pH, total alkalinity, and calcium hardness of the water. If any of these are off, scaling or corrosion of the tub and equipment can occur. The alkalinity should be tested and adjusted before testing the pH because alkalinity helps control the pH. If the alkalinity isn't correct, the pH will drift back and forth.

Calcium hardness is a measurement of the minerals in the water. If calcium is low, the water will draw from other minerals, such as copper,

aluminum, and iron. An adjuster is needed to bring the water back to balance and keep the water clear.

"Sometimes everything tests perfect but the water is still cloudy," Worful said. "This is caused by particles too small for the filter to trap. Using a water clarifier brings the small particles together into a larger particle so the filter can pick it up."

At least once a week shock the water to burn up all the organic matter, eliminate odors, and reduce irritating contaminants. This leaves the water fresh and clear.

Before you buy a spa, get to know the dealer. How long has the company been in business? Is their reputation and customer service good? Do they give a written warranty of the spa? Do they test water in the store? Does

the company service what they sell, or do they outsource? Do they give energy costs in writing? Energy costs are important. You don't want to buy a low-cost spa and then have it double or triple your electric bill.

"The main thing is to have a good experience when you get a hot tub," said Tom Stratton. "Spas are not just for entertaining. They are for therapy, relaxing, families connecting and spending quality time together." ■

# Home is where the hearth is

The fireplace is the traditional center of the home. Without it, where would we curl up with the cat and a good read on blustery evenings? And where would the family gather on winter nights, dads in their slippers, kids in their footed pajamas? Homeowners are focusing more than ever on the hearth, and finding more decorating possibilities than ever.

In many homes the fireplace is used rarely, if at all, and the 21st century home does not depend on fireplaces as the main heating source as homes did years ago. Still, the US Census Bureau found that homeowners consider a fireplace a characteristic of a "good home." And homes with fireplaces catch a better price than those without.

And custom fireplaces have become more popular in recent years, according to Garret Van Horn of Architectural Stone in Troy, thanks to advances in marble cutting and polishing. New technologies have slashed marble and granite prices, allowing homeowners to use the real thing instead of simulated materials.

So, what is it about the hearth that makes a house a home? David Kallis, design consultant of the Expo Design Center in West Bloomfield cites the tendency towards nesting and the desire to "come home to a relaxed atmosphere and warm ambience." Lynne Moran of Virginia Tile agrees. "It represents warmth — especially with cold Michigan winters."

With all the options, how can you tell what's best for you? Your fireplace should reflect your

lifestyle and the use of the room, noted Van Horn. If your family is more likely to gather around the television than a fireplace, have a





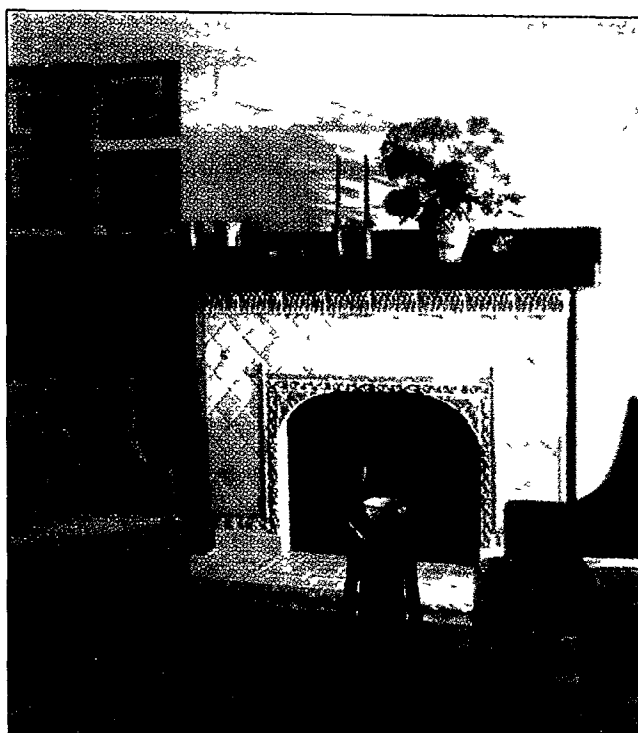
hearth with minimal details, accents, carvings and accessories such as tools and screens or even just a simple wood stove. Accordingly, if the fireplace should be the focal point for the room and your family, consider heavy moldings, colors and layering of materials (stone, tile, wood) for pieces that make a strong statement.

If you want a change but want to put off installing a new fireplace and surround, don't be afraid to change your fireplace screen and tools for a fireplace facelift. According to Kallis, the renewed interest in hearths has inspired companies to produce more varieties of screens for homeowners to choose from. "They're beautiful and can change the look of a room."

## Hearthwarming decorating tips

### The hearth room

The hearth room can be its own separate room or the great room, but is usually an extension of the kitchen, warm with ambience. Said Kallis, "I had one client who said, 'I want to see a roaring fire when I cook. I want to feel there is no where else I want to be but in this room.'" This room has a casual feeling with cozy chairs and provides guests with a place to mingle while the cook prepares the meal. For homes pressed for space, homeowners might consider a smaller cast iron stove for the roaring fire atmosphere without the space loss.



### Global village

Starting with the country French and Provence look, more and more American hearths are borrowing from Europe and abroad. For a look straight from the French countryside, use ceramic tiles to accent the center of your surround, contrasting beautifully with light irregular stones and bricks. Add a hammered iron screen and iron tools, for the final decorator touches, according to Kallis.

Other hearths reach farther across the globe for a Mediterranean or even Mid-East flavor. For an old world effect, Moran suggests a surround that also mixes hand-molded tiles and

stones with irregular edges, but using warmer maroons and dark browns. Think terra cotta, Moroccan tiles and mosaics.

### Nantucket

According to Kallis, the Nantucket look harks back to simple coast living. This hearth has a clean country feel using colors such as white, gold and blue. The look is complemented best by wicker furniture, nautical objects such as ships, and a light screen, decorated with ivy or another minimal garden theme

### Lodge

The lodge look is popular in cottages up north or anywhere a family wants a casual, friendly, log cabin living feel. These surrounds use large tumbled stones and accents with animal themes.

### The elegant formal living room

For more formal rooms, think colder materials, such as light polished marble and granites. These surrounds can have more detailed carvings and accents, and are usually more imposing.

### Modern

This fireplace is sleek and smooth, polished with square edges, said Van Horn, in contemporary rooms finished off with metals and slates. 🏠

## Margaret Ann's "Sunday Best" Roast Chicken

1 3 1/2-to 4-pound roasting or frying chicken  
1 to 2 bunches of your favorite herbs for stuffing (tarragon, sage, thyme, or rosemary)  
1 to 2 1/2 cups chicken broth or stock, homemade or canned  
2 yellow squash, cut in 2-inch chunks  
2 turnips, peeled and cut in 2-inch chunks  
8 small red potatoes  
2 medium Vidalia onions, peeled and quartered

2 large carrots, peeled and cut into 1-inch pieces  
1 red bell pepper, seeded and quartered  
1 green bell pepper, seeded and quartered  
3/4 cup heavy cream  
3T all-purpose flour  
Salt  
Fresh ground black pepper

Preheat the oven to 400°F.  
Rinse the chicken and pat dry. Tuck the wing tips under the body of the chicken.





Stuff the cavity with the herbs and tie the legs together. Place the chicken in a roasting pan large enough to hold the chicken and the vegetables, which will be

added later. Pour the broth around the chicken and place in the oven. Roast for 20 minutes per pound, basting every 15 to 20 minutes.

Forty-five minutes before the chicken is done (which may be after only 15 minutes or so), remove the pan from the oven and scatter the squash, turnips, potatoes, onions, carrots, and peppers around the chicken. Return to the oven and continue cooking and basting until done.

Remove the chicken and vegetables to a serving platter, tent with foil, and set aside. Strain the pan juices into a heavy saucepan. Whisk together the cream and flour in a small bowl until smooth. Gradually whisk the thickened cream into the pan juices, bring to a boil, and cook, whisking over medium heat for 2 or 3 minutes. Season to taste with salt and pepper.

Serve the chicken surrounded by the vegetables, with some of the sauce poured over the vegetables. You may need to put some of the vegetables in a separate serving dish if your platter is not very large. Pass the remaining sauce in a gravy boat.
