




The wall mural - themed Earth, Water, Wind and Fire -


### Elementary boundaries shift amid rapid district expansion

A recent decision by the Northville Board of Education set the wheels in motion for attempting to alleviate overcrowded conditions at Silver Springs Elemen.

Due to an exploding amount of growth in Northville's elementary schools, particularly Silver Springs, school board officials opted to redraw the boundary lines and reroute students from three new aubdivisions to neighboring Northville schools.

According to school officials, the changes will be as follows: the Stonewater subdivision residents will attend Moraine Elementary School, the Woodlands Subdivision residents will attend Thornton Creek Elementary School and



the Northville Hills Subdivision (East and West) residents will attend Winchester Elementary.

School officials said current fourth grade students affected by this action will be given schools of choice priority to remain at Silver Springs for completion of the fifth grade if space is available. Fourth grade students affected by this action in 2002-2003 will be given school of choice priority to remain

at their elementary for completion of fifth grade. Fifth grade students affected by this action in 2002-2003 will be given schools of choice priority to attend middle school with their classmates if space is available. Finally, all choice options require parents to arrange their own transportation to and from school.

### Want to learn about Johnson Creek? June 2 is your day

Celebrating our unique resource is the message of Johnson Creek

On June 2, the Johnson Creek Protection Group will be celebrating the life of the coldwater stream with a day of activities and fun at the Fish Hatchery Park as well as in various locations around Plymouth, Northville and Salem townships. Johnson Creek Protection Group's natural features chairperson Janet Bernardino said the day of activities are designed to be an informative and fun celebration for residents living along the Johnson Creek watershed.

For that matter, it's also an opportunity for anyone else interested in learning about the creek that runs through Northville township and city as well as both Washtenaw and Wayne countles. The creek is just over 12 miles long.

"This is part of Rouge River Day and it's a great opportunity to become educated on the history of Johnson Creek and the conservation efforts being made to protect it." said Johnson Creek Protection Group's natural features and greenway committee chairperson Janet Bernardino.

According to Mindy Carr, an organizer of the protection group as

well as an engineer for Ayers. Lewis, Norris and May Inc., there will be a Johnson Creek Nature walk at the Western Wayne County Conservation Association, which is located at 6700 Napler Road in Salem Township, Carr said the guide for the walk will be WWCA representative Bob Laich.

On the walk, Bob Laich, who knows this section of the creek best, will be showing the stream bank stabilization efforts and projects being performed by the WWCA in that area of Johnson Creek that is in Salem township," Carr said. Bob will familiarize participants with the history, fish, wildlife and current problems with the creek."

### Apartment complex: cats can stay

### Handicapped tenant and roommate allowed to retain feline companions

By LON HUHMAN

The cats can stay, and so can Wayne Moran and Rebecca Dale. 'i'm glad it's over, but we should never have had to go through this," Moran said. "I still

feel as if my rights were violated."

Moran and Dale were faced with a potential eviction from their Swan Harbour apartment for not complying with the apartment complex's pet policy, but the possible eviction case was dismissed on May 16 by 35th District Court Judge John Mac-

Moran said he has signed the complex's new pet policy contract. Moran and Dale are now being allowed to keep two cats. one of which is not declawed, without having to pay a 8250 non-refundable cleaning fee or the 825 per monthly charge. Before the new contract was presented, the Swan Harbour apartment policy stated that a renter was only allowed one, declawed cat that was registered with the

"The eviction case was dismissed because Swan Harbour

agreed to change their pet policy on an individual basis with Mr. Moran and Miss Dale." Moran's attorney Jim Billicki said. "The only carryover from the original policy is that they have to register their cats with Swan Harbour management.

Billicki said their defense was based on the idea that according to federal law, an exception should be made in the case of handicap or disabled persons. Both Moran and Dale have handicaps. Bilicki said Swan Harbour's stance was that the law did not apply in Moran's situa-

Swan Harbour manager Adam Kalaydjian could not be reached for comment. His attorney Christopher Hartman could not be reached either, but the leading attorney of his firm. Mark Makower, said the issue was resolved due to the two parties

### Township man pleads guilty to eavesdropping

Northville Township resident Dennis McVittle entered a plea of no contest in Livingston County Circuit Court last Friday to three charges of eavesdropping.

McVittle, 51, had been charged with six counts of cavesdropping for secretly videotaping women as they changed clothes at his Brighton talent agency, Dancin' and More. According to McVittle's attorney Sean Zayas, the plea of no contest was entered because McVittle is facing a civil lawsuit filed by a woman he had videotaped. Zayas said a guilty pleacould be used against him in a civil trial.

McVittle's no contest plea entails having three of the six felony cavesdropping charges against him dropped. Each charge carries a maximum penalty of two years in prison and \$2,000 in fines. He will be sentenced on Aug. 9.

McVittle originally faced six charges of felony cavesdropping after a 22-year-old University of Michigan female student visited his studio in January. The woman was changing into a bathing suit in the agency's changing room and

noticed a VCR hooked up to a hidden camera that was on record. The woman took the tape, viewed It at home and then handed it over to the Brighton city police department. Brighton police seized additional videos from his studio and with the assistance of the Northville township police department they also selzed videotapes from his home, totaling 250 tapes.

According to Brighton city police detective John Westendorff, after the charges were announced in February and when the story ran in the media, more than 100 women contacted the Brighton police to learn if they had been secretly videotaped while at McVittie's studio.

Westendorss said at least 12 to 15 women recognized themselves in a three-ring binder that contained still images from the videotapes, which was compiled by the police. Westendorff said the police department's goal was to get names for the faces on the still





for CCW assistance

Michigan should follow the example set by the peace-loving citizens of Vermont. Article 16 of the Vermont Constitution (which has been in effect since 1793) says: "That the people have a right to bear arms for the defence (sic) of themselves and the State — and as standing armies in time of peace are dangerous to liberty. they ought not to be kept up; and that the military should be kept under strict subordination to and governed by the civil

Article 1. Section 6 of the Michigan Constitution (1963) says: "Every person has a right to keep and bear arms for the defense of himself and the state." (Subordination of the military is addressed in subsequent sections.)

The language in both documents is virtually identical. Yet Vermont, in compliance with the Second Amendment to the Constitution of the United States (which succinctly states: "...the right of the people to keep and bear arms shall not be infringed") imposes no permit or licensing requirements or fees to posses or carry firearms. That doesn't mean possession and use of firearms isn't regulated. Vermont has many statutes restricting where, when, and by whom concealed weapons may or may not be carried.

There are no blazing "wild west" gun battles in the streets of Burlington or in the 31 states that have adopted "shall Issue" CCW laws. Nor will there be any in Northville or other Michigan cities. Michigan should comply with its Constitution and that of the United States and do away with the permit process altogether.

renovation to our high school. Based on current enrollment projections, we will outgrow the current high school by the 2002-2003. school year. Also, 20 percent of the proposed bond will go to updating technology and based on my experience in my elementary school, this update has been needed for awhile. The rest of the money will go to expansions and renovations at several existing buildings and a land purchase.

There will also be two additional ballot proposals related to school needs. The first is for one-half mill to be used for facility repairs and contracted services to maintain the district's existing assets. The second is a Headlee Override proposal to return the non-residential

millage to 18 mills. The Headlee proposal will not increase costs to residential property owners. The total costs for all three proposals will be \$200 annually for owners of a \$200,000 home.

There are parts of the bond proposal that I wish were different and I even considered voting against it. However, no proposal would be agreeable to 100 percent of the people and the effects of not voting for it would be devastating to Novi's school kids. Many people move to Novi (and keep our property values on the rise) because of our excellent education programs. in order to keep that premier level, I would urge everyone to get out on June 11 and vote "Yes" for Novi schools.





### Township offers land to postal service

Continued from 1

Abbo said a possible location would be the 17 acres of township land along Seven Mile Road. He said 4's acres of that could be given to the post office for the construction of a distribution center. The 17 acres to set aside for civic or community purposes, Abbo said.

According to Abbo, the board of trustees recognized that a retail postal center located in the city is beneficial to both communities. Abbo said that the idea of a resolution of this type came about last summer at the city public hearing. but since there has been a membership change on the township board since that time, a reaffirma-

tion was crucial to demonstrate the township's support. The resolution has one key detail.

The offer is that the township is willing to give the post office 4', acres of township-owned property in order to build a distribution center, but the post office must be also willing to keep the retail center in the downtown," Abbo said. "There is no offer if the post office does not agree with keeping the retail center in the city.

Mayor Chris Johnson said the resolution brings together both communities on the issue allowing them to be stronger when it comes time to present a plan to the post

"I think that a split facility is useful in that it allows for future expansion," Johnson said. "The growth 15 or 20 years from now should be considered in the plan because future expansion, which will probably be needed, on the present property would not be possible if the current location is expanded and both retail as well as distribution are kept under one

According to Northville postmas-ter Emily Liedel, the post office is not aware of the resolution at this time, but she said all alternatives would be considered.

\*Alternatives will be explored, but a split facility would be the least feasible one," Liedel said. "This is because of logistical and transportation problems that can arise from having split operations. We prefer to have everything under one

Both Johnson and Liedel said the post office expansion plan is on a temporary hold, but the city still believes its best bet is to be prepared when the time comes to work with the post office to finalize a

slammed the door in my face. Now I bet the same woman would be friendlier and more


polite to someone on the Internet than she was to me - her neighbor just a couple of doors down.

When the grass gets long and the sun gets hot Northville and Novi residents turn to people like the Haydens to give their yards the weekly

A soft breeze blows over the freshly cut grass while the Northwest lawn crew jumps into their work truck on to the next

The homeowner walks out to inspect the newly cut lawn only to look down to see the brick path, which was another job well done by Northwest Lawn and Landscaping Service Northville Township.

"I love the outdoors," Northwest co-owner Ben Hayden said of his reason for leaving the hotel management business for outdoor landscaping and lawn mainte-

1987, they officially started the company. Now 16 years later. the company is busy as ever running around the Northville. Farmington Hills, Plymouth/Canton Bloomfield Hills communities mowing lawns and doing landscaping work. Ben oversees the landscaping part of the company while Sharon is in charge of the lawn service. The Haydens picked the name Northwest as a tribute to their original home

"I'm from Washington and Sharon is originally from Oregon," Ben said, "So by naming our company Northwest, we are paying homage to our original home area of the country.







The season is one reason to add salt to fish pond

g. We have a kol and goldfish pond with a few plants in it. We have heard that we should add salt to the pond, but we are unclear about how much is OK, how much is too much, what it does and will it hurt the plants?

A. Lets cover the reason why first. The fishes' body are saltier than the water in the pond. So, water wants to even out the two different salt levels to one average level. The fish have to expend calories to maintain salt in and water out of their body. They have a slime coat, scales and skin all trying to keep the water out, but they are constantly Breathing and swallowing water in. Their gills and kidneys are always trying to get rid of that water. This energy could be used for growth, immune-system work, etc., if the

water were saltier. If you see a fish that is inflated like a ballbon and the scales all sticking out at right angles from the body, you see a fish that is drowning. It may have any number of disdases or other problems, but by the time you see the scales sticking out it has kidney or gill failure and it can not get rid of the

water build up in the body.
In a typical goldfish pond. I pound of salt per 100 gallons of water will benefit the fish Without harming anything else. Ten pounds of salt per 100 gallons of water is used as a dip for a few minutes at a time. Kol and goldfish are very tolerant of salt. I once did the wrong math and had 10 times the salt ih a salt dip tank and the fish immediately keeled over in the water and could not maintain their balance. I pulled them out diter 10 to 30 seconds and placed them in unsalted water and they showed no ill

Raising the salt level in the pond to 3 pounds per 100 gallons over a week or so. will help to get rid of many parasite problems. This practice is often recommended first thing in the spring or when new fish are in quarantine, before adding them to the gond. Keep the salt level at 3 pounds for about three weeks and then slowly decrease il back down to I pound or to zero.

in a pond with a functioning biological filter, there may be a dip in the population level of the bacteria if the salt is increased tho fast. During those few days, the ammonia or nitrite level could spike up to dangerdus levels. If you overdose the salt, just remember the old adage: The solution to

pollution is dilution. Most water-garden plants, and such other animals as frogs and snails, will not be harmed at all by the 1-pound rate. The 3-pound rate vill slow the growth of some plants and may kill some plants that float in the water, but it is not a good algae-control method.

The best salt to use is kosher or pickling salt. It must not have any anti-caking ingredients, such

fish. Solar and water-softener salts are not the best to use.

Q. I want to build a small hill in my yard to plant on. What is the best way to do this?

A. First, make sure the hill or berm, as it is technically called, will not block the drainage of water on the property. Do not cover many tree roots or pile dirt around the trunks of trees in the berm's path.

The best soil to use is the best topsoil you can afford. An entire berm made from good topsoil will grow fantastic plants. A berm made of clay or other fill soils and capped with some topsoil on top will not grow plants nearly as well. This is especially true of berms created by heavy machinery where the soil or clay is compacted. It is amazing how tolerant plants are of people's follies. but the people never seem to learn how

badly the plants are really doing.
If you do not have good topsoil available and want to create some, try the following recipe. Use one-half topsoil, one-quarter peat moss and one-quarter shredded bark mulch. Change the recipe to one-third of each if you want to grow plants that prefer a more acidic soil.

If possible, till and mix the soil from the area to be covered with the berm, using the new soil so there will be a blending of the two soil types. This will help the roots grow into the surrounding area. Do not think that the plant roots will only stay on the berm, especially if it is less than 10 feet across. Pick the plants to go on the berm carefully. The berm will be a dry area. because the water will run off quickly rather than sinking in.

Plants like Colorado spruce, that are often planted on a berm for extra screening, do not do well. That's because there is no irrigation or the roots do not have a chance of growing into the low area at the foot of the berm where the water is.

be attributed to these excellent subcontractors, many of whom Palo has worked with for years. "We've found some true craftsmen," said Bryce.





# All decked out: New deck styles, types and more

hether you plan to use traditional wood for your deck or alternative materials, you have many options, many choices to make. Most importantly, you want to keep in mind that you are putting an addition on your home that should be carefully designed to suit your needs while enhancing the value of the home.

"I like the natural wood more," said Frank Mantel of La Pergola in Berkley. "Especially cedar."

You may agree with Mantel, who worked at his craft in Italy for 15 years before coming to the U.S. five years ago. However, the growing supply of alternative decking materials indicates a growing demand for these alternatives.

A decking material called Trex, a blend of wood pulp and plastic, is gaining popularity because it's a lifetime product that requires no maintenance, but costs about one-third more than wood.

"People are sick of the maintenance," said Brad Upton of Dillman and Upton Lumber in Rochester. "We offer a wide variety of surfaces."

Composite materials made of a blend of recycled plastic and wood pulp have advantages over wood such as no splinters and no yearly staining and sealing. However, the wood pulp in the composite tends to fade to gray over time.

A new product on the market is called Eon. This is a polystyrene material designed to look exactly like natural wood and it comes in redwood, cedar and pine designs. Eon requires no surface nails, no maintenance, and has better traction when wet than wood. The Eon motto is "Beauty like this doesn't grow on trees."

Vinyl is another alternative with advantages over wood.


"Vinyl siding has proven itself over time to be more durable than siding of other materials," said Joel Tarnopol, president of Dexter Innovations in Oak Park.

Nearly 20 years ago vinyl was adapted to fencing, then the materi-

al was made textured for slip-resistant decking, and UV inhibitors were added to warrant against fading. "Originally, the warranty was 10 years, then 20. Now it's a limited lifetime warranty."

"Decks for hot tubs and pools are a good application for vinyl," he added. "Pool chemicals don't harm it."

Vinyl is available in light colors to help keep the surface cooler. Ed Rys of Lenover Building Supply in Livonia points out that vinyl will hold up to Michigan's hot summers and harsh winters better than wood.



"A vinyl deck can cost between 20 percent and 40 percent more than a wood deck, but it will last longer, is guaranteed for life, and the homeowner won't spend a lot of money maintaining it," Rys said. "So for the long term, a vinyl deck is price competitive to a wood version."

Homeowners Larry and Joan Cotsonika preferred natural wood for their new pine and cedar deck built by Creative Wood Products of Fenton.

"The deck was finished in two days. We'd recommend them to anybody," said Joan. "They were wonderful, they left no mess, they even cleaned up the sawdust."

"We buy all our own lumber directly from the mills to con-



trol the quality of the wood," said Dennis Schaefer of Creative Wood Products. "We manufacture all our own work, spindles, gazebos, benches, custom posts. All the craftsmen are employees, not contractors, so we can assure the best quality-control in all facets of the materials and workmanship."

This also means lower costs for the customer due to the buying power and in-house work.

The unique 10,000-square-foot showroom at Creative Wood Products is something you will not want to miss. The ceiling is painted like the sky, and there is a three-story Victorian home inside the showroom.

Visiting showrooms will give you many more ideas for the design of your deck, which is all-important.

"There are three main points to consider," said Mantel. "First, the deck must be functional. What will you use it for? Do you have kids? Parties? Do you want a place for your hot tub?

"Second, work within the requirements of the city or subdivision where you live. What are the codes or restrictions, such as a certain distance from the property line.


"Third, it must be aesthetically beautiful."

Taking all these factors into consideration, you can see why each deck needs to be designed specifically for your home and your personal needs.

Mike McCoy, president of Coy Construction in Walled Lake believes that aesthetics are the number one factor to consider. "If it doesn't look sharp, it doesn't add value."




The deck color should match the color of the house trim to accentuate the fact that it is part of the house, not a separate entity hang-

ment, so take note of natural elements. Would a set of stairs echo your yard's natural elevations? Keep nature in mind as you gather ideas for your deck.





# The new vacation spot: Patio furniture for your outdoor room

Whith the increase in gas prices and airfares the last few years, more people are taking their vacations at home. They are finding their place of relaxation and enjoyment "right in their own backyard." This place is usually called a deck, patio, or porch.

This place doesn't have to be a cold gray slab of concrete, a square of splintered planks with a lawn chair on it, or a picnic table under a shade tree. This place can be an extension of your home - an outdoor room. A beautiful place. A comfortable place. A place to entertain or to take a nap. It can be in the backyard, front yard, side yard, garden, or off a bedroom. Wherever you decide, with functional and beautiful furnishings and accessories, you can make your outdoor room as comfortable and inviting as

your living room.

In planning your outdoor room, approach it as you would an indoor living space, by considering the shape and space available, budget, and your family's lifestyle.

"There are more styles and colors of patio furniture available today than ever before," said Gerry Visel, of Cornwell Pool and Patio in Ann Arbor and Plymouth.

The style or mood of the home should carry over to the outdoor room. Outdoor furniture placement, as with interior design, is best when arranged for conversation, dining, quiet time, or to take advantage of a view, and with a good traffic pattern.

"Think about where your doors and steps are," Visel said. "You shouldn't

have anything blocking those areas. A pathway from the door to the steps should be available so you don't have to go around the furniture." A large deck can be too small if the traffic pattern is not good.

"People don't think about how much room it takes for a table and chairs," Visel said. "You need at least an 8 x 8 foot



deck for a round table and four chairs." In small areas, Visel suggests using an oval table. It may fit better than a round one. Ovals are a little bigger but not as wide as a round table. If the deck isn't wide enough, you can't pass by with a round table.

How many people will you need to seat at one time? If you plan to party with 30 or more, will your space accommodate them? The size of your space and how it is to be used is vital information in planning your outdoor room. Larger areas can handle a barbecue grill, serving cart, small tables, chaise lounge and other accessories. But you're better off not overloading a smaller area with too much furniture.

A large space can be divided for different purposes: A table and chairs for dining on one side and a chaise lounge for relaxing on the other. With a multi-level deck, the table and chairs can be on the level with the barbecue seating areas, and an occasional small table can be placed on the other levels.

The barbecue and table are usually near the kitchen, and should be in an area where the barbecue won't be bumped or where smoke won't be a nuisance. To be on the safe side, the barbecue should be kept off the deck, or at least have clearance on all sides, and not be below any overhanging trees or other flammable material.

For those less than perfect days, an umbrella can shade the area while adding charm. They come in several styles, colors, sizes, and price ranges, and some will even stand up against the wind without turning inside out. Awnings, shades, walls of fabric, flowers, or climbing plants are other beautiful ways of protecting your guests from the weather and providing privacy.

If you don't want your guests to be left in the dark, don't forget lighting. Candles, plug-in lighting, swag lights, and lights that clamp on the umbrella make your outdoor room safer, create atmosphere and add evening romance.

When shopping, don't buy the cheapest materials, Visel suggests. Better-made furniture will be stronger and will last longer. And try it before you buy it. "Anybody buying patio furniture has got to sit in it to determine which fits them best," he said. If a person needs to use their arms to help them sit in or get up from a chair, Visel says, a chair with arms and straight legs in front is best. A chair with curved front legs will tip forward if you put weight on the front of the chair.

With the beautiful outdoor furniture and accessories available today that can turn your outdoor room into year-round enjoyment, home is a very nice place to be indeed.


# Simple and secure: The ease of manufactured and modular homes



Pactory built housing. A concept so logical and simple that it's a wonder it isn't the norm in the building industry. As owners of modular and manufactured homes know, there is a substantial benefit to having your home built in what Jim Kuhn, president of Suburban Homes in Mount Clemens, calls a "controlled environment."

"Your roof is built under a roof, and two roofs are better than one," he explains. "It's also built on a production line, which keeps the costs per square foot under control."

Because building materials are not exposed to the elements and all of the laborers are together at once, factory-built homes are done in a fraction of the time that "stick built" homes, or homes built on site, are. And having a home done on time, according to Eric Glossop, private property and modular division manager for Suburban Homes,





makes a much better investment for the homebuyer.

"The advantages for the consumer are quality, cost effectiveness, and timeliness," he says. "All of those relate to money in the long run."

# A house in two-halves

Modular housing, sometimes confused with manufactured housing because both are built in a factory, can resemble a stick-built house in every way, except for how it is constructed and moved to the site. Chris Grayjek, owner of CDM Construction in Brighton, describes it

as a home in two-halves.

"Imagine the home you live in right now, saw it down the middle, put each half on a trailer, take it to a site, lift it with a crane, and put it on the foundation," he says. "If you live in a typical stick-built home, a modular home is no different."


Built to the same state guidelines as stick-built homes, the Building Code Authority Administration (BOCAA), modular homes are available from 1,000 to 2,800 square feet, depending on the manufacturer, and built with 2-by-4 or 2-by-6 construction. They can include everything that a stick-built home does, and are able to be stacked to make two or three story homes, hotels, apartments, and office buildings.

Once a modular home is set on the foundation, very little work remains beyond joining the two halves together at the "marriage wall." The carpet is seamed together, trim is added to the doors and archways, and the plumbing, which has already been run through at the factory, is hooked up.

Compared to the time required in building a traditional stick-built home, Grayjek says the difference is considerable.

"A typical stick-built house takes four to six months to build," he says. "A modular home might take you four to six





weeks to finish from the time that it is set on the foundation...so, from a construction standpoint, you've just lopped off anywhere from three to four months of construction lending."

In addition to the timing factor, many builders and manufacturers are able to customize a modular home to

the buyer's expectations. At Quality Modular Homes, Inc. in Brighton, president Yvonne Lewis offers up to 70 different plans and styles of homes, ranging from small, starter-home ranches, to two-story colonials.

"The homes are all customized, so it's not like you're getting one house with one kind of countertop or carpet," she says.

Modular homes, says Lewis, serve as an alternative for people who want a 6,000-square-foot house, but cannot afford it.

"Our homes are in the price range of people who can't really afford to build that beautiful, 6,000-square-foot house," she says. "They're content with their 2,000-square-foot home, but they want to customize it for their needs."

# Similarities and differences

Besides for the ability to customize a home and having it built in a factory, there are few similarities between modular and manufactured housing.


Formerly referred to as trailers, manufactured houses are delivered completely finished to the site and set on to a "pier" system, a foundation that anchors the structure. The home must stand up to rigorous standards enacted by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), which include durability, fire resistance, transportability, energy efficiency, and quality control, as well performance standards for plumbing, heating, air conditioning, and heating. Most manufactured homes can even withstand winds up to 150 mph.

Before the federal standards were enacted in 1976, Tina Failla of Chateau Communities in Clinton Township, says that manufactured housing was viewed as an affordable form

of living that lacked any safeguards. While they are still affordable, manufactured homes are much safer. And homebuyers have taken notice.

"People have decided that not only are they securely built homes, but they can be just as beautiful as any stick-built home," she says. "Walking in the door of a manufactured home, you would never know that it was one."

Generally, manufactured homes are available from 1,200 to 2,400 square feet, and can be built in more than one section. Most are located in private communities and can include garages, decks, cathedral ceilings, skylights, and whirlpool baths.

Sidney Moss, co-owner of Medallion Homes in Northville, says that compared to 10 years ago, the overall quality of manufactured homes has grown significantly.

"The materials have gotten better and the asthetics have

gotten better," he says. "There are sunken living rooms, sunken tubs - anything you can put in a stick-built house, you can put in a manufactured house."

In addition to the amenities in and around the home, many communities provide recreational centers, children's play areas, and pools. Providing residents places to gather, says Failla, is what manufactured housing communities are all about.

"You have the ability to have close relationships with your neighbors, take part in community events, and have close proximity to a pool and recreation room," she says. "It's an affordable means of owning a home, along with the

lifestyle."

Manufactured homes make a good option for seniors or young couples looking for a starter home, because the home is purchased, but the land on which it sits is leased. And compared to renting an apartment, says Moss, it is a much better investment.

"For maybe the same money that it costs to rent an apartment, you can live in a community and actually own your home," he says.







considerations coming first and prices that can range from hundreds to thousands of dollars.

"Play equipment can be custom-tailored to the surroundings because each yard is different," says Jim Noettl, operations vice president of the Doll Hospital and Toy Soldier Shop in Berkley.

Besides offering hunter green, epoxy-finished sets to blend in with grass and shrubbery, Noettl has natural wood combinations that can be stained to match decks or fences. For those who want more color in their surroundings, canvas canopies can be added.

"The optimum place for equipment is near a window or door wall so that the kids can be watched by adults inside," says Noettl as he refers to shades that complement materials used in the home. "It's not a good idea to place the equipment near flowers because they could get trampled."

Playhouses and play sets referencing Noah's ark are among the popular backyard diversions sold at Peter's True Value Hardware in Milford.

The play sets can bring some architectural interest to the landscape as they offer multiple levels, gangplanks and various configurations.


"People who are considering bright colors should also consider the views they might impose on neighbors," Grebeck says.

Wright sells recycled rubber products (\$13 per 50-pound bag) as a safe




ground cover that comes in black or multi-colored pieces to give the look of confetti.

# Opening doors: Options for your garage door






have a U-shaped bottom weatherseal that conforms to irregular floors to seal out the elements.



#### Lawn care questions answered

Question: My husband and I are avid gardeners and have converted our yard into a cutting garden with small plots of grass between our flowerbeds. We have a difficult time maintaining the grass because of the tight space. Any suggestions?

Answer: Many gardeners are finding that a tool from the past-a reel, push-type lawn mower-is the perfect solution. With no engine, a reel mower is lightweight, easy to push, and starts and stops when the user does, making it easier to maneuver through small patches of grass without ruining the plants and flowers.

#### Question: How often should we sharpen our mower blades?
