# Cambridge plan squeezes by

By the narrowest of margins, the proposed Cambridge Place development cleared a major hurdle as developers pitched their plan to Northville city council Monday evening.

pany went before the council and

Cambridge Development Com-

received preliminary planned unit development and site plan approval for the company's proposed Cambridge Place development. Mayor Chris Johnson, as well as mayor pro-tem Carolann Ayers and council member Tom Swigart voted in favor of the project. Council members Kevin Hartshorne and Jerry Mittman voted against it.

The motion to grant preliminary approval included the conditions that the developers address the height, scale, mass, parking, vehicular circulation, public amenities and architectural quali-

The project would be situated on the south side of Cady Street and would be a mixed-use development. According to city manager Gary Word, the development project has been through several city board and commission reviews, such as the preliminary approval granted by the city planning commission on June 26.

As proposed, the mixed-use development would be five stories tall with an underground parking area. There would be three stories for residential purposes and two

stories for office and commercial use. The total square footage would be 110.152 square feet and public amenities would include a 2,800 square foot public plaza with a water fountain.

Word said the planning commission gave its approval that included five conditions:

In the past the show has been held at Hillside Middle School and recently at Arbor Hills Landfill, formerly BFI waste Systems. The Northville show was canceled this year after decision made by the Northville township board of trustees, which also made the decision to donate \$3,000 to the Northville July 4 parade.

"I made a recommendation to the board of trustees to not support a fireworks show for several reasons," Northville township manager Chip Snider said. "I don't think a fireworks show is good use of residents' tax dollars."

## Woman learns just saying no to robber saves purse

Getting testy with a would-be thief may have proven to be the difference for a Northville Township woman, who scared away two assailants from her home last

While the woman was relaxing Phillips, 21, in her home June 26, she was confronted by two men who demanded she hand over purse. The men were later apprehended

by Northville township police.

According to Northville township police detective Kevin Bias, Paul and his juvenile accomplice entered the

around 10:30 p.m. Bias said the men entered the house through the garage door, which was open at the time. Blas said both men were wearing bandanas over the faces to conceal their identities.

\*Mr. Phillips informed us during questioning that the house was selected at random," Blas said. With the garage door left open. the house became their prime target. Their main intention was to rob someone."

Phillips, a Frankenmuth resident and his 16-year-old male accomplice, found the woman sitting in the living room reading a book, Bias said. Phillips was armed with a crowbar. Bias said the men then demanded the woman's give them her purse and

"The woman did not relinquish her purse, but instead argued with them," Bias said. "This lead them to back out and leave the house."

Bias said the woman's husband

was arriving home as the two suspects fled the house. The husband proceeded to chase the men, but the two suspects eventually got away. However, the township police caught up with the suspects the next day.





# Cracraft, Radwanski to split Hillside principal duties

When the school year resumes in late August, Hillside Middle School will have co-principals and a new assistant principal at the

Jim Cracrast has been promoted from assistant principal of Hillside to the position of principal for the 2001-2002 school year. The school board approved his appointment at its June 26 meeting. Cracraft, along with the new assistant principal, will be receiv-

from principal Jeffrey Radwanski until he leaves the district in

Cracraft said he is looking forward to his new duties as princi-

"I'm looking forward to leading the Hillside staff and continuing to serve the children and families of the Northville school district," he said. "I just consider it a privilege to continue to work with kids. I'm looking forward to my new role."

Cracrast, who has been a part of Northville schools for the past six years, has been a teacher at Meads Mill Middle School, an assistant principal and will soon take on new duties as a co-princi-

Although Hillside will have two ing further administrative training principals, school officials said

they would each have unique duties and separate responsibili-

According to Cracraft, Radwanski will be serving as mentor and guide and will be helping create a smooth transition for the newly appointed school leaders.

Jeff will be mentoring and basically helping provide for a smooth transition for [my] principalship and the new assistant principal," said Cracraft. "I'll be coordinating the many programs that will be housed here at Hillside as well as assuming the [role of] principal.

Radwanski said that although he and Cracrast will share a title of co-principal it will be Cracraft that takes the reigns of the school.

The way I view it. Jim is going to be in the point position," said Radwanski. I envision that my

role will be a mentor and advisor to Mr. Cracrast and the new assistant principal. I believe there should be no mistaking about it. Jim Cracraft will be in the point position. He will be there for the long haul.

Radwanski said having a single principal is the correct approach

I think there has to be one principal," said Radwanski. "I think there has to be one person in charge.

For example, Radwanski said establishing a vision for the school and setting the expectations needs to be made by one person.

"I see myself as a mentor and an advisor, [but] I will not not shirk any responsibility related to students, said Radwanski. There has to be one person setting the

vision, one person setting the tone with teachers for goals and expectations. James Cracraft will set the vision for the school."

Radwanski also said that it will be an asset to the district to serve as a co-principal and a mentor.

"It's a tremendous advantage for the district," he said. "The word 'co' does not imply that I am now an assistant principal."

Radwanski said he will be sharing the daily principal duties but the duties will primarily be han-

dled by Cracraft.
"It will be done in consultation with me. It needs to be Jim's direction.

"I have no problem guiding Jim and handing the gauntlet over to him. This decision makes sense."

Radwanski said Cracrast will be the one writing newsletters, conducting staff meetings, setting the





## Stewart threatens to break ranks on redistricting issue

As lawmakers voted to send their redistricting bill to conference committee Thursday, where a final version can be hammered out, one Republican representative said he might just attempt to derail the plan that has been on the fast track in

Rep. John Stewart, R-Plymouth, said he may break ranks with his caucus over the way the district boundaries are drawn.

The loss of just two more Republican votes in the state House would doom the plan, which Democrats strongly oppose.

"Apparently there are several others who have raised objections and they said we better send this back to a conference committee," Steward explained, although no other Republicans have stated publicly their objections to the GOP plan.

Stewart's immediate concern is the way the 20th House District has been drawn.

"I haven't found one person in my district who thinks this is good common sense to lump Northville. Plymouth together down a 14-mile dog leg to the city of Wayne. It is possibly even more winnable for me...but this district, on its face, just looks bad. This would come back and haunt the Republican party. It would just look like gerrymandering."

He believes that shape violates the "compactness" standard, one of several criteria in the law for legislative district boundaries.

John Stewart is wrong. Rep. Bruce Patterson, R-Canton, said. "John Stewart's (district) is far more compact than any number of people around the state because 'compact suggests to me that it is a certain size. Compactness is not necessarily square. I would ask him to give you the definition of compactness.

Compactness does not equal a 14-mile dog leg.' Stewart responded Actually, according to apportionment laws passed last year, "com-

pactness shall be determined by circumscribing each district within a circle of minimum radius and measuring the area ..inside the circle but not inside the district.

But the 20th is not the only district where compactness is an issue. Stewart also noted that GOP designers split the communities of Trenton and Grosse lle downriver. Democrats have pointed out that the 65th district in Jackson County meanders from Lenawee County to Eaton

County. The 81st district in St. Clair County includes the north section of that county and a southern portion, but the sections are connected by only a sliver of land.

The new district boundaries for both the state House and Senate will go into effect in 2002 if lawmakers eventually settle on a plan in the once-per-decade process of reapportionment. The plan is contained in House Bill 4965 by Rep. Andrew Richner, R-Grosse Pointe Park.

Representatives adopted their districts last week. Senators added their districts into the bill Tuesday. June 26, in a strictly party-line vote.

Democrats have been vocal in their opposition to the plan, claiming Republicans are rushing it through.

Republicans have again demonstrated that their guiding intent in this process has been to draw a politically gerrymandered plan to protect their own political self interest." Rep. Gilda Jacobs, D-Huntington Woods, said. "Shamefully, the abuse of power by the Republicans in this process comes at a high cost

to the people of the state of Michigan, who deserve to have a legitimate, representational system of government and a voice in the workings of it."

It is wrong that the Republicans excluded the public out of the process. It is not known why the process was accelerated by the Republican leadership," Rep. Nancy Quarles, D-Southfield, said.

Patterson, on the other hand, said he is satisfied with the way the process is proceeding.

"It is a highly technical, very expertise-oriented discussion and you could have hearings from now to the general election date in 2002 and real people aren't going to be able to contribute to the discussion to make sure that there is an abiding to the legal standards unless they do an awful lot of research. legal research." Patterson said. "I have done an enormous amount of reading - cases, manuals, statutes in preparation for redistricting, he

In western Wayne, Livonia, West-

land. Wayne, Northville and Plymouth would be placed in the 6th Senatorial District. Canton would be placed with Van Buren and Romulus in the 8th District. The 15th District would include West Bloomfield, Novi and South Lyon, extending north to Rose and White Lake. Orion and Springfield would be part of the 29th district also with southern Genesee County.

In the House, districts as drawn would be: In Western Wayne, Livonia, Northville, Plymouth and the City of Wayne would be drawn into one district. The 21st District would consist of Van Buren, Belleville and Canton. Westland, Garden City and inkster would be drawn together in another district.

In Oakland, Rochester and Oakland Township would be drawn into one district. Another district would include townships from Addison to Holly, as well as Rose and Orion. Waterford, northern West Bloomfield and Orchard Lake would become the 43rd District. Independence, Springfield. White Lake and Highland becomes the 44th. Milford would be included in a district with Brighton and Howell. Southern West Bloomfield and Commerce become the 39th. Nov., Wixom and Lyon Township would be drawn together. Farmington and Farmington Hills get their own district. Pontiac and Auburn Hills would make another district. Southern Southfield gets its own district. Northern Southfield would be included with Birmingham. Bloomfield and Bloomfield







# Senior Center's future linked to post office fate

The future of the Northville Senior Center appears to be unknown, as the possible expansion of the Northville post office looms on the horizon.

Senior Adult Services coordinator Susan Koivula said the senior center, located at 215 W. Cady Street, has other concerns besides the future of the post office. Kolvula said providing proper facilities for activities and programs for Northville seniors sometimes has the senior center using other community facilities.

Our two-story building is not really sufficient now." Koivula said. "Our upper floor is not handicap-accessible and it's pretty trying on some of the seniors to get up and down the stairs."

According to Kolvula, the senior center is a community resource available to all Northville seniors age 50 and older. Activities and programs that take place at the center include blood pressure check-ups, aromatherapy, massage therapy and tai chi. Koivula said the center also serves as a central location for senior center staff to coordinate such programs as the daily telephone call to check on a senior's well being called telephone reassurance, medical equipment loan, Focus: HOPE distribution, senior newsletter and transportation service.

We are a well-rounded tool that can provide seniors with education on health and community opportunities as well as transportation to the supermarket or any other location in the community." Koivula said. "We are an important and useful community service.

She said one objectives of the center is to listen to the needs of the seniors and work to provide them with the wanted as well as enjoyable activities and options they would like to participate in. However, one drawback in trying to provide the activities the seniors want is having ample space so they can conduct the activities.

The seniors are quite active. both mentally and physically. We have a whole range of options and our facilities are just not large

enough for us to keep on providing various services in the future. Koivula said. "It would be nice to have a larger facility."

The post office expansion is on hold because of financial issues within the United States Postal Service that will not be resolved until this fall, city manager Gary Word said. In addition, future plans for a new sentor center are also on hold until Northville Township officials can complete their strategic planning initiative. Northville Township trustee Richard Henningsen said. The strategic plan is expected to be completed in the fall. Township manager Chip Snider said the strategic plan allows the township to assess their current services, land and building space and usage in order to determine the course of action the township should embark on in administering the proper services to the community.

We work for the city and township. With the strategic plan going on now there are no definite plans for our future." Koivula said. "However, a solution will be needed in the near future. I believe we

will have one."

Henningsen, a member of the Northville senior citizens advisory council, said the present location is still usable, but the seniors will need at least a short term fix for a new location. Henningsen said a possible short term solution would be the use of the Northville Recreation Center on Main Street. However, Henningsen said changes would be necessary for the senior center program to be temporarily moved into the recreation center.

\*Clearly, the current senior center is inadequate for the type of

services they want to provide," Northville parks and recreation director Traci Sincock said. They need more space and our facility could be a possible short term solution, but renovations would have to be made."

Koivula said the rec center possibility remains the only realistic solution for a quick fix to the space problem, but she said the program will remain working wherever it is located. She said the ideal location would be one floor. have plenty of parking and class-

"Hopefully, we will have a larger facility in the future, but we will remain here as long as we can," Koivula said. "It is important that the seniors have a central location that can provide for them an independent lifestyle as well as acting as a common meeting place for them to enjoy the company of oth-







# Qualified thumbs-up given to police videotape policy

A bill introduced by State Representative Alan Sanborn that proposes to videotape confessions made to police in felony cases was being greeted with cautiously open arms by local police.

Sanborn, R-Richmond, introduced the House Bills 4958 and 4959 as a result of issues raised by the Justin Mello murder case in Macomb County. There had been two men held in jul for six months for confessions they made pertaming to the murder of Mello, but they claimed their confessions had been coerced. A third man already in jul later confessed to the murder.

Sanborn said the purpose of the bill is to support police in that it could be used to demonstrate that a confession was not forced. However, the bill also states that a confession that a non-videotaped confession would not lead to dismissal of the felony charges. Northyille

Township police department chief John Werth said there were some obvious concerns with the bill.

"We haven't had any problems in the past pertaining to confessions, but I like the concept," Werth said. "The problem is, how do we properly implement it? That's my primary concern with it."

Northville city police chief James Petres said constructing new facilities and coming up with the proper funding remain the two major issues and will for some time because the bill does not address those matters. Sanborn said there were a number of potential problems with his bill.

"We will be working with policy agencies to make sure this is workable." Sanborn said. "We don't want to require tape recording of every arrest. That would be implausible."

He said he does not want a bill that would require officers to carry additional equipment around with them while on patrol. He also said this may be a problem with smaller departments because of funding. He hoped to get input from police departments and agencies over the summer and that the House Criminal Justice Committee will consider the bill in the fall

"We get a written confession and on occasion as in serious cases, such as a sexual assault, we get it taped as well," Werth said. "Right now as it stands this bill is an unfunded mandate and with our current as well as small facility, it seems far off at this point from being realized."

Petres said he remained concerned about the information that would be obtained that was not videotaped. He said he does not want the bill to circumvent any information the officer may have collected by legal means, despite not being on videotape.

# Novi police headquarters prepares for grand opening

Within the next month, or so, there will be an unveiling at the revamped Novi Police station.

"We're planning on a grand opening," Novi Police chief Doug Shaeffer said. "In about four weeks, we'll have the public in to view the new faculty."

Inside the Novi Police administration offices, the carpeting has been replaced and downstairs the new lobby has been constructed. Outside, the entrance way has been reconfigured to allow easier access for the handicapped.

Behind the police station, where workers are putting the finishing touches on the new lock-up that would provide a safe environment for officers and prisoners alike, they are putting on the final coats of paint.

each other and cook up alibis."

According to Shaeffer, the city needed an expanded jail area to keep male and female inmates separated. Shaeffer said the department had difficulty housing female prisoners because there was not enough space for them.

Shaeffer did say while work on the outside of the building had been behind schedule, workers continue to work on the inside renovations.

Novi City Council approved the \$1.9 million expansion modifications to the project last summer

after a citizens committee determined several modifications and renovations were necessary. A 1998 bond issue approved the origteal funding for the project

inal funding for the project.

The project, which was originally scheduled for completion sometime in early April, was pushed back because of the significant snowfall in December. The project is now expected to be finished by the end

of the month.

City officials did say the project would come in on budget and there would be no cost overruns due to the winter slow down.

The original plan also calls for the station to be made handicapped accessible, have additional storage space and gain a training center for officers. There will also be an expansion of the vehicle repair garage.



Handley, who has held office for the past four years on the board, ran unopposed in this election. Her new term will end in 2005.





## Survey results draw picture of what seniors want in housing

By LON HUHMAN

The expected growth of the senior population in southeastern Michigan has the Nerthville housing commission exploring the need for new senfor citizen housing

The final survey report supports what we believed and that is, there is an interest for additional senior housing in the future." Northville Lousing commission director Joanne highs said. Predominately, there was interest in two bedroom, ranch style housing which is something we did not know prior to the survey."

Inglis said the senior citizen population in the metro Detroit area is expected to increase by 100 percent within the next 30 years and because of this the commission requested a group of University of Michigan students from a masters course at the school of urban planning to conduct a survey of Northville senior citizens to determine if there is future interest and need for additional senior hous-

ing in the Northville community. Inglis said the survey first wanted to gauge the interest and then get an idea of what style of housing residents would prefer. A total of 500 surveys were mailed to registered voters over the age of 50 in the city and township.

Of the 500, 140 were mailed to city residents and 62 were returned." Inglis said.

According to Inglis, 40 percent of the city surveys were returned. The one problem the students concluded from the results of the survey was that the definition of "independent senior housing" may have been confusing to some. Inglis said. She said Allen Terrace is independent that it only provides affordable housing as well as the option of one meal per day for its senior residents.

\*Many people associate senior

housing to assisted living and that's not what we are," Inglis said. "We expect our residents to be able to take care of their own daily needs. We are not much different than the Main

Inglis said another interesting survey conclusion was that those who answered the survey said they were willing to pay for extra services, such as the addition of a computer room. She said one detail, which the Northville city council found intriguing, in the financial area of the survey was that there existed an interest for a reverse home equity mechanism. Inglis said the equity tool would be a

good method of freeing up equity that Allen Terrace works to fulfill somemay be otherwise locked up in residents' homes.

The mechanism was discussed and attributed to the potential residents that are currently homeown-

The survey report said the reverse home equity appears to be an innovative and attractive approach allowing for the housing development to have greater flexibility in how it allocates available cash, which could ultimately result in reduced costs that is passed on to the consumer. # We can work out the bugs of CCW

It was about as clear of an expression of voter will as there can be -260,000 signatures on a petition drive that required only 151,000 to put Michigan's new conceal weapons law to a referendum.

But the Supreme Court found a way to keep that vote off the ballot. In its decision issued late last Friday, in a case known as the Michigan United Conservation Clubs vs. Secretary of State and the People Who Care About Kids committee, the court ruled 4-3 to keep the referendum off the ballot and allow the conceal weapons law to take effect.

The new "shall issue" CCW legislation became law in Michigan on Sun-

Now, if the People Who Care About Kids committee members still want to have an election on the concealed weapons issue, they'll have to launch yet another petition drive and collect another 242,000 signatures in 180 days to put "initiative legislation" on the ballot.

It would be easy to get discouraged. Running a petition drive is no small amount of work, and to have the Court toss it all out, when there is little question the legislature was playing games when it tacked on a \$1 million appropriation just to block a vote, must be disheartening.

Still, the committee members promise they'll come back with another petition drive. And we hope they do. There is much that needs to be repaired in the CCW law. No, it wasn't all bad and much is worth keeping. But a long list of changes is needed to.

The positive side of this is that committee members can now draft "initiative legislation" in their petition to fine tune the CCW law, rather than simply tossing it out as a referendum would

What lawmakers did was change the conceal weapons law from "may issue" to "shall issue." Where county gun boards previously had discretion, the legislature said they must issue permits as long as applicant meet certain criteria. The list of requirements includes being age 21, having a clean record, having no history of mental ill-

ness and that applicant's take the required training course.

What needs to be fixed in the law includes:

· Applicants should also be required to "show a need" to carry a concealed weapon. Gun boards in the past typically required that, but there was no agreement on what constituted "a

Debate over what was considered a legitimate need to carry a weapon is part of what lead to this debate in the

Petition authors can address that directly by specifying what constitutes

If that "showing of need" is added, the "shall issue" wording of the law would make more sense. The shall issue verbiage could be left in the law.

· The so-called "village idiot clause" needs to be revised. This is a catchall provision in the new law that allows gun boards to reject permits for those who would present a danger to themselves or others, but don't have a criminal history or a background of mental illness. The problem is that, on appeal, the gun board must have 'clear and convincing evidence" of that danger to show to the court. The legal presumption should rest with the county gun board. The applicant should be able to show evidence that he or she is not a danger.

• The time period given to gun boards to conduct background checks on applicants is seriously too short. Set in the new law at 30 days. it is half to one third the time given gun boards in other states.

· Lawmakers' ruled out applicants with a history of mental illness but there is no good way for gun boards to check on that history. The petition should require the state to create some system for checking on the mental background of applicants.

The court's decision was a bad one. But there is an opportunity in it for Michigan voters.

If petition authors consider carefully their petition wording when they rewrite it, they have an opportunity to vast improve the new law, not just

### ■ Record should look at Hartshorne

Northville city councilman Kevin Hartshorne is most frequently quoted in your paper as voting "no" on one issue. no" on another issue and then again. "no" on something else. Does not at least his consistency merit a bit more coverage regarding his reasoning and his positions

In his personal conversations, councilman Hartshorne seems to position himself for the preservation of downtown Northville as it previously was during his youth; commerce, trade, thriving familyowned businesses offering both city and surrounding community residents a broad spectrum of services and merchandise.

Unobtrusively but steadily, the "merchant" offering and flavor of the Northville Central Business District (CBD) is being replaced by offices and condos with more on the immediate horizon. Is this the basis for Hartshorne's complaints?

A single CBD building, which housed a general merchandise business for over 100 years now offers a limited merchandisc line on its first floor with the second floor converted to multiple offices, one office of which alone has recently housed as many as 23 employees - each arriving for work in their own car.

A visual survey of the two-lot parking area behind Comerica undertaken at 8:30 a.m. this past Monday showed only seven unoccupied parking spaces. By 9:10 a.m. there were only two empty spots.

Where are customers supposed to park? Northville cannot maintain a viable mercantile district without plentiful functional shopper" parking. The time is now overdue for the city to create substantial new parking sufficient to accommodate shoppers as well as office workers.

CBD building owners have been paying

enormous amounts into a parking fund for years, even for outlying lots and decks their customers cannot functionally use, recent office constructions already dominate or by ordinance they cannot legally

Instead of utilizing as much as \$1.5 million of CBD and resident tax monies to facilitate the expansion of the post office (USPS) on Wing Street, these funds should be utilized to create new downtown park-

The USPS is, after all, now a private business. If it wants to expand at its current location, let it do so but at its own expense. Northville needs more parking nor more post office.

If councilman Hartshorne wants to preserve the traditional merchant atmosphere of the city, he should work to obtain sufficient customer parking to allow merchants to remain. If his "no" votes on new construction in the CBD are based on parking concerns, we should learn more about his positions from the Record.

# Northville streets to be improved in coming months

Residents of Northville should notice the improvement of several streets this coming winter, with work expected to begin this summer on two downtown streets. In addition, residents that wish for a walkway along Eight Mile Road will be happy knowing the State of Michigan will help support the project.
The Northville city council

Monday night awarded a construction contract in the amount of \$488,600 to Peter A. Basil Sons, Inc. of Livonia for the reconstruction of east Cady and Randolph Streets.

Northville public works director James Gallogly said the city has allocated \$360,000 for east Cady and \$250,000 for Randolph in the city's 2001-2002 budget. He said \$97,000 for the east Cady project was supplied by the Downtown Development Authori-

'Cady Street will be reconstructed from Griswold to East Main Streets and Randolph will be reconstructed from Eight Mile Road to Center Street," Gallogly said. "Peter A. Basil Sons was the lowest bid and they performed the work done on Center Street, so they are reliable. Work could begin within a month."

Gallogly said that because there is a significant amount of development occurring along, or proposed for the Cady Street corridor, proposed construction on the segment of Cady between Center and Griswold has been placed on hold until the summer

Both projects will involve removing pavement before repaving as well as drainage. landscape and curb work being

Gallogly also informed the city that the Michigan Department of Transportation awarded the city with \$140,000 in funds so the city can construct a walkway along Eight Mile.

The project is expected to cost \$218,000 with Northville Public Schools and the city supplying \$80,000 a piece. Gallogly said the project entails having the construction of a 10-foot asphalt walkway with landscape to run along Eight Mile.

According to MDOT director Gregory Rosine, the state-awarded funds is a part of the 2002 transportation enhancement program for aiding communities in an effort to make Michigan a better place to live. Rosine said the Eight Mile project is one of 97 selected in the call for projects worth \$20.4 million. Gallogly said the project will potentially begin in the late spring of 2002.

The walkway project was initiated because of the safety issues that were apparent for residents walking along Eight Mile. A completed walkway will address this as well as provide residents and the students who walk along Eight Mile with a much better and safer route," said Northville mayor Chris Johnson.

Rep. Andrew Richner, R-Grosse Pointe Park, introduced what can only be described as a stealth apportionment plan Thursday. June 14. The bill was literally blank. It contained no description of districts. It contained

At a hearing the next Tuesday, scheduled by Elections Committee chair Rep. Bruce Patterson, R-Canton, Democrats put their plan on the table for public viewing. But Democrats also made a tactical error, making a motion to approve their plan. That gave Republicans a chance to escape the committee room without ever having to show theirs.

They jumped at it without hesitation. By Thursday afternoon, June 21, Richner had a 403-page bill ready to go for consideration on the floor, complete with maps. And they had built a consensus in caucus, 57 of them in agreement to support this suddenly produced bill.

They quickly tossed out the Democratic plan they d approved in committee and replaced it with Richner's stealth plan. Then they voted final approval for it as fast as they could - no time for messy analysis by the opposing party, no time for any unseemly commentary from the public.

Republicans apparently expect us all -Democrats, the press and the public alike to believe they didn't have the plan done one week earlier when Richner introduced a

blank bill. They apparently expect us to believe it wasn't done two days earlier for the committee hearing.

The process of apportionment has long been dysfunctional in Michigan. In 1982, the state Supreme Court tossed out a section of the state constitution that assigned the job to an apportionment commission. The court said the commission was unworkable. And it was right.

But the justices ordered state lawmakers to come up with another system, and what they came up with was to let Representatives and Senators draw their own districts.

It is an obvious conflict of interest, but one state lawmakers conveniently ignore.

Bills were passed last year that they sweal will make apportionment fair this year.

But if the recent actions of the House are any indication of how this process will proceed, it is clear it's still dysfunctional.

Hopefully the justices of the Supreme Court will see that when it gets to them - as it always does — and order apportionment be taken out of the hands of the state House and Senate.





# Townships consider Haggerty's congested future

\*Originally, a traffic study was required because of the large office complex proposed on Haggerty Road in Northville Township and an even larger office complex in Plymouth Township on the southeast corner of Five Mile Road and Haggerty. Northville township planning commission vice-chairperson Richard Allen said "The developers in both townships performed their own

traffic studies and the data raised many questions.

According to Allen, the questions prompted the planning commission to request that a joint traffic study with Plymouth township be conducted to look at the entire Haggerty corridor with respect to the two office parks. The developments are Northville Greens and Plymouth Lakes. Northville Greens, which will be located on Haggerty north of Five Mile, is proposed to be 239,000 square feet office development and Plymouth Lakes is proposed to be a 635,000 square feet.

Allen said the approval of the Northville Greens development was held up until the study was completed and reviewed by all affected parties so they could generate a cost effective solutions to the increased traffic. A prehminary plan with traffic solutions has been developed by Parsons Brinckerhoff. Allen said the Northville Greens project has

been approved.

"It was a good thing the joint study was done because the solution for the entire affected area was different than that proposed by each developer's traffic study."

Allen said Wayne County has tentatively committed to making the required road improvements in 2003-2004. He said as a result of the joint study the Northville Greens project was approved and believed 2003 would arrive before

there would be significant occupancy to either of the office complexes.

The study stated that the core challenges are to facilitate access to and from Interstate 275 via Six Mile Road as well as 1-96 via Schoolcraft Road, enhance capacity of Haggerty and to minimize driver inconvenience. The preliminary solutions are being developed with the goals of addressing the core challenges, being cost effective and providing an improvement plan in phases to address growth up to and beyond

The most far reaching solution has Haggerty being converted into a six-lane divided boulevard in the vicinity of Six Mile Road, according to the study plan.

### 300-meter hurdles Brian Matthews, Milford 40.3 seconds



# Greetings from Camp Wannakombak



two-week camping program. \*Children set up tents and counselors stay all evening until 11 a.m. when parents pick them up," Calhoun said. "It's a good time. The kids really enjoy that."

The camp has one camp counselor for every 10 campers and the Kiddle Camp has one counselor for every eight campers.

Children leave the camp with more than just memories.

They learn a lot from the activities but the biggest thing that they learn is how to interact with other people," Calhoun said. "The social structure is everything in this camp.

Later, they switch so everyone will be able to participate in the same activities. Their day ends at 4 p.m. at Camp Wannakombak and 3 p.m. at Kiddie Camp.

Jenna Bradley, an 8-year-old three-time camper, said she enjoys all of the activities except for the nature trail walks because she doesn't like bugs. She looks forward to when she spends the night and she believes that she has learned how to swim well from attending camp.

"I have a lot of friends here and I get to see a lot of my friends and counselors," Bradley sald.

Erin Kern, a 9-year-old camper who has been attending camp for three years, said she likes hiking. swimming and art at the camp. She would rather be at camp then spending her entire summer at

"I am usually really bored at home," Kern said. "It's something to do and I have a lot of friends here. It's fun.



# Even with simple decoration, bowls have increased value



These mixing bowls are an example of the Apple Series produced by the Watt Pottery Co. of Ohio. They were made in the 50's and are worth \$250 to \$275.

Q. Enclosed is a photo of two mixing bowls that I received from my grandmother. They are part of a three-piece set in graduating sizes that vary from 3 1/2 inches tall to 5 inches tall. On the bottom of each bowl are the words "Watt - USA - Oven Ware," along with a number. Can you provide any information on the manufacturer and the value of my bowls?

A. Watt Pottery Company was a family-run business that was located in Crooksville, Ohio. from 1922 to 1965. For 10 years, from 1952 to 1962. they produced their Apple Series decorated with dark red apples and green leaves against a cream background. There were several variations of the Apple Series that include reduced-decoration apple, double apple and open apple. Your bowls are examples of the reduced-decoration apple design. Some of the Apple Series pieces were used as sales promotions for hardware and grocery

The numbers are mold numbers. Assuming your circa 1952 mixing bowl set is in excellent condition, it would probably be worth \$250 to

Q. This mark is on the bottom of a porcelain basket that I recently inherited. The basket stands about 9 inches tall and is decorated with red apples and green leaves.



Intertwined branches form the handle. It was a wedding gift to my great-grandparents around 1900. What can you tell me about my basket?

A. Amphora Work Riessner used the mark you enclosed. They were located in Turn-Tephtz. Bohemia, from 1892 to 1945. The letters "RSt.K" represent Riessner, Stellmacher and Keller, Austria was included in marks on porcelain and pottery

prior to World War I, because Bohemia was part of the Austro-Hungarian Empire. Objects marked

"Czechoslovakia" were made after World War I. Your basket would probably be worth about \$400 to \$450.

Q. At a flea market, I bought a 1-quart earthenware container that is decorated with a mottled blue design against a cream background. On the bottom are the words "Robinson - Ransbottom - Roseville U.S.A." Could you please tell me something about my "flea market find?

A. Robinson-Ransbottom Pottery is located in Roseville. Ohio. They have made stoneware from 1901 to the present. Because of the inclusion of the word "Roseville." people often assume incorrectly that it is a Roseville Pottery mark.

Your stoneware container was made sometime around the middle of the 20th century and would probably be worth about \$25 to \$50.

Q. I would like to know the value of a World War I poster that I have. It has the image of a young woman in a navy blue uniform with silver buttons. At the top are the words in red, "I Want You," and below those words, "For the Navy." Also printed on the poster are the name 'Charles Christy" and the date "1917."

A. World War I and II posters are popular collectibles if they have not been cropped and are in very good condition. Large quantities were produced during both wars to support the war effort and encourage patnotism.

If your poster. I Want You for The Navy, featuring a woman wearing a sailor's uniform by Charles Christy, measures 40 inches by 28 inches, and is in very good condition, it would probably be worth about \$750 to \$900.

# Luring the anglers

Owner nets dream, starts own pro bait and tackle shop in New Hudson.

> As a kid, Carl Stencel and his friends fished in the Detroit River. Or in the Huron River in Flat Rock.

Or at Proud Lake, where they'd spend the summer.

He never dreamed that one day he'd own his own pro balt and tack-

But those early fishing days must have paid off as Stencel is the owner of C.C.W. Lures located on Grand River Avenue in New Hudson. It's one of the most complete and customer-friendly fishing shops

around with everything an angler needs. You can find a wide range of rods and reels: lines, lures, and bobbers; supplies and equipment, and nine varieties of live bait.

And it's got Carl Stencel, a man who knows fishing.

'I've tried all kinds of fishing." he said, "and I've enjoyed them all." Bass fishing is still his favorite.

"With salmon fishing, for example," he said, "you stay in one place, and if the fish aren't biting, it's not too exciting." However, with bass fishing, he said, you move around and try dif-

"Even if you don't catch anything for a while," he said. "it's still inter-

dropped. Then, in 1999, he decided that he no longer wanted to work as a plant supervisor in a small factory. He quit and opened up C.C.W. Lures. He's

been there ever since. Although the business keeps him busy, he still gets out a few times a week to fish.

"You know." he said, "it's funny. I've fished all my life and I own a

tackle shop, but I don't eat fish." He believes in catching and releasing, and doesn't kill the fish he

At one point in his life, he liked to fish in tournaments, but doesn't do it

much anymore. I just finished competing in a father-daughter (contest) Lakeland with my daughter. Krystelle, he said. but it wasn't

because it was a tournament. "It was because I enjoyed spending the time with my daughter."

He does sponsor tournaments. however. He is a co-sponsor of the Oakland Bass Masters of Michigan annual tournament and conducts a local contest out of his store each

"This year (in the local contest), the longest fish in each of eight categories wins a prize," he said. It costs five dollars to enter and all the money goes toward prizes with 60 percent for the adult divisions and 40 percent for the kids.

Each of the categories are split into adult and children divisions. The categories are large-mouth bass. small-mouth bass, pike, crappie, bluegill, perch, muskie, and walleye.
