City still cool to Cambridge development

Height, parking remain sticklers for PUD approval

As the saying goes, there's always next year. But for developers who were forced Monday to wait until late January to learn whether or not Cambridge Place would ever become a reality, those words were of little comfort.

The same issues that arose when the project appeared for preliminary council approval last summer were again the main topics of debate for the public hearing, which lasted nearly three hours.

Height, mass, traffic and parking remained the primary sticking points challenging the council's final decision, but no definitive stance was taken. The final PUD and site plan approval for the mixed-use Cambridge Place may occur at the council's Jan. 22, meeting.

The decision's postponement came after two council motions were dropped because of lack of support. The first motion — issued by council member Kevin Hartshorne and favored by council member Jerry Mittman — included the stipulation that the Cambridge planners lower the building by one story from its proposed five stories. Mayor pro-tem Carolann Ayers then made a motion to have the council introduce for first reading an ordinance amending the city's ordinance providing for PUD zoning for the

development and have its possible adoption on Jan. 22. The motion was not seconded and died before making it to a vote.

"It is getting late and bad decisions can be made at this time of night," mayor Chris Johnson said as the Cambridge discussion came to a close just after 10 p.m. "I think we need to step back."

Cambridge is proposed to be built on Cady Street and is proposed to be 113,578 square feet with office, commercial and residential space provided. Public amenities include a 2,800 square-foot public plaza, water fountain and pedestrian linkage with the core downtown area.

More than 30 residents were in attendance. Many commented that they liked the project, but they still had concerns with several specifics.

As proposed, the height of the project will be 65 feet on its north side and 78 feet on its south side. By being a PUD, the project is allowed to work outside set ordinances, but those who opposed its height believed it would take away from the downtown skyline and may create a "table top effect" by appearing to be one, long flat surface. In addition, many residents stated the project may set a precedent for future buildings along Cady Street that may be just as big and add to the table top effect.

Cambridge architect Greg Presley said the building will only be one story higher than the average two story building on Main Street and because of the 20 foot grade differential from Main to Cady, Cambridge Place would fit on Cady and not appear to be over-

Marijuana, ecstasy pills seized in city drug bust

Northville Township Detective Paul Sumner said Monday both the township's and Northville city's joint search of a home off of West Eight Mile Road for drugs was very successful, as police the confiscated 38 ecstasy pills — which at the street level can be priced at from \$8 up to \$20 each — and at least six bags of marijuana.

A 19-year-old Northville man was in possession of the seized evidence, but he has not been charged yet because the pills and marijuana are currently undergoing laboratory testing. Possession of one pill of ecstasy is a felony. According to Sumner, preliminary testing did indicate the pills have a correlation with ecstasy, a popular club drug which produces high energy levels and enhances the senses. Sumner said the 19-year-old's parents did not have any knowledge of the drugs within the home.

Sumner said the search represented one of the largest such confiscations for either department. He also said evidence pointed in the direction of the suspect being a seller and distributor of drugs since an electronic scale — which had "Northville High School" printed on it — and an ample amount of baggies containing marijuana were confiscated.

"Our cooperation with the city has always been good, and this, particular case demonstrates

both departments' zero tolerance stance and how successful cooperation can help take drugs off the street," Northville Township chief John Werth said of the search at the home on Summerside Lane.

Sumner said the drug raid took place on Dec. 12 just after 2 p.m. and had the township and city departments working together along with a dog unit from the Plymouth Township department. City police detective sergeant Dave Fendeleit from the township obtaining reliable information regarding drug activity occurring with the city.

"This was an ongoing, six-month investigation between detectives Sumner and Fendeleit as well as the maintaining of good communication between myself and Chief Jim Petres. We received credible information that we passed onto the city and this exchanging of information continued up until we obtained a

35th District tapped to add third judge

State Representative Bruce Patterson made it a goal of his to create a third judgeship for 35th District Court in Plymouth in order to lessen the burden on the current judges so they could provide a better quality justice to the community. Last week, that goal was crossed off the "to-do" list.

"It has been exciting as well as exhilarating for me," said Patterson, R-Canton, of the process of moving the bill, which

he sponsored and introduced last May, through the legislature over the course of the last year. "Establishing a third judgeship for the 35th District Court was a campaign promise of mine and it has been a high priority for me ever since. Now we will wait and see if the governor approves it."

Patterson said the House of Representatives passed the bill with a 106-1 vote and the state Senate with a 20-12 vote. Senator Thaddeus McCotter, R-Livonia, voted in favor of the bill as well. Patterson said both McCotter and

Senator Loren Bennett, R-Canton, helped moved the bill along through the Senate.

The 35th District serves the communities of Northville, Northville Township, Plymouth, Plymouth Township as well as Canton Township with Judge John MacDonald and Judge Ronald Lowe presiding. Patterson said growth in the five communities caused the need for an additional judge. The district court handles civil and criminal cases, which includes small claims, arraignments, traffic cases and tenant dis-

putes. "We are very excited and pleased," MacDonald said of the legislature's approval. "It has been long overdue, but now we have every expectation that it will be signed by Governor Engler and we have Representative Bruce Patterson as well as Senators Thaddeus McCotter and Loren Bennett to thank for this."

MacDonald said the case load was just to much and with an ever growing community, a third judge-

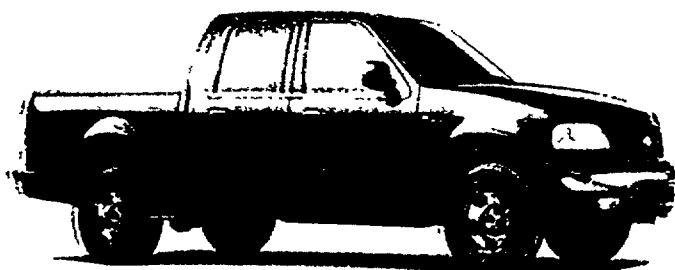

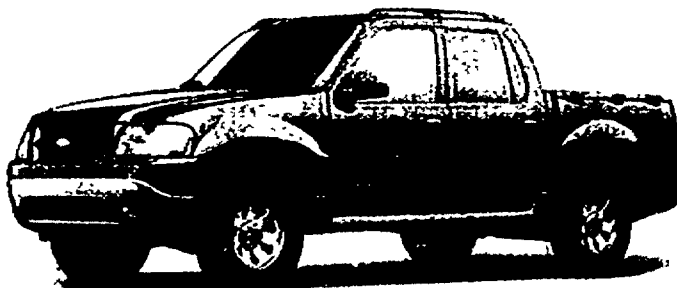

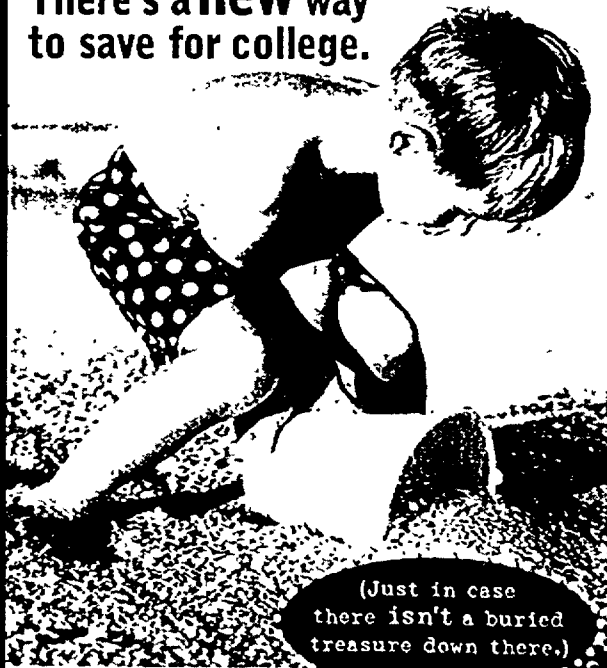

"Just for Kids" is a charity that assists sick children at local area hospitals in a variety of ways.

Zimmer said that her charity, which was formed this year with the help of her friend Mike Hopkins, is collecting the phones in Northville and will then give them to the Wireless Foundation. She said the Wireless Foundation will then provide a donation to "Just for Kids" for the cell phones. The donated phones will then be reactivated and distributed.

The collection deadline is Jan. 3. Zimmer said the cell phone fundraiser is one of several ways that the charity is working to provide assistance to those in need.

"I've always wanted to raise the money to help kids that were sick," she said. "That was my goal."

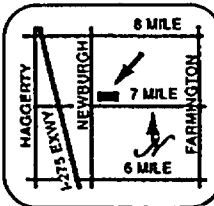
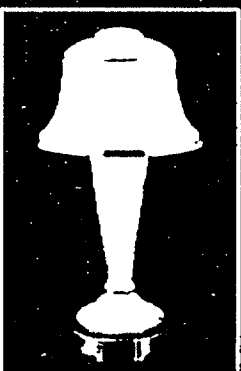
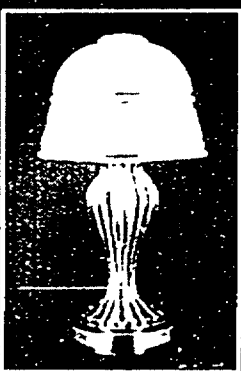

Northville Civic Concern reaps benefit from SEALS

Learning to give to others became the lesson of the day as South Lyon SEALS (Success Education, Academics, Leadership and Social skills) students donated food and time to the Northville Civic Concern recently.

The middle school alternative education class, taught by Mandy Verardi and Kevin Ferguson, chose to volunteer at Civic Concern and learn the valuable lesson of helping others in their community and surrounding areas.

"It's a chance to give back and help out the community — something [the students] don't normally get a chance to do," Ferguson said.

To travel to Northville on Nov. 30, the students had to help out at home and earn \$5. The \$5 then was used to purchase food to donate to Civic Concern and earn the students a ticket to help out at the center.

"I watched my 3-year-old sister for an hour a day for five hours. She calls herself 'The Beast,'" said

SEALS student Jessica Day. Most students like Jason Jeziorski, Mark Caristo, A.J. Hoy and Ansley Donahue cleaned their room or vacuumed to earn money.

However, Bryan Wassenaar helped his father, who recently had surgery, by stacking and cutting wood to heat their home.

The value of their trip was not lost on the students, who helped residents carry food to cars.

"This is fun and you get to help out society," SEALS student Kori Buchan said.

Food donated included brand-name cereals, evaporated milk, American Choice products and a hit of the day: shortbread cookies.

SEALS was invented by Verardi and Ferguson who saw a need with students who were not successful in traditional classes. These students had poor grades and low attendance.

Most of the students in the program were required to write papers as to why they wanted to be in SEALS. Twenty-three students were accepted and since August, 85 percent of the students' grades

have shot up one or two marks, from Ds and Fs to As, Bs and Cs, Verardi said.

Verardi said every day is different in terms of lessons and the individual time given to the students is dramatically more than in traditional classrooms.

She said they have the students all day, compared to 50 minute increments.

"I wouldn't change jobs. It's a challenge but the success of the students is worth it. You should see their faces when they get their report cards," Verardi said.

Although many of the students said they did not want to be in SEALS at first because they were afraid of being made fun of, most will agree the program has worked for them.

"I like it. We never have any homework," said Pat Minton, SEALS student.

Left-out: traffic study focus is Center Weddings

Hubbell, Roth and Clark, Inc. has drawn up a downtown traffic study for the city of Northville that could be called nothing than less than prodigious.

HRC representative Dick Beublen gave a presentation of the study and its recommendations at the city's joint meeting, which included the city council, planning commission, downtown development authority and historic district commission on Dec. 10 at city hall.

Beublen offered a number of recommendations for traffic operations and pedestrian improvements that included prohibiting left turns for traffic on Center Street at the Main Street intersection, maintaining the existing one-way operation on Mary Alexander Court as well as completing downtown curb drops on all the corners and providing a crosswalk across Main Street on the westbound approach of the Hutton Street and Main intersection.

There were some good and bad aspects to them, but after further examination and discussion of them it made more sense," mayor Chris Johnson said of the study's recommendations. "Overall, it was very well

done and it gives us lots to think about."

The study indicated the recommended improvements aim to strike a balance between the desire to have traffic move at reduced speeds or travel on alternate routes, as well as the desire for a reasonable amount of traffic to support local businesses. The charge of the study was to analyze traffic flow in the downtown area, safety of non-motorized traffic and the impact of the proposed post office expansion.

The recommendations did not come as a surprise to Jim Gallogly, the city's director of public works.

"It's basically what I expected. There were no surprises," Gallogly said. "I took from it that we are in pretty good shape downtown, but there are some little things that could improve downtown vehicular and pedestrian circulation that we should consider."

Gallogly said the "no left turn" at Main and Center recommendation is something the city has been discussing for the last several years and he said it wasn't long ago when the intersection did forbid left turns. The next step may be installing an illuminated case sign at the intersection indicating no left turns were allowed. The operation at Mary Alexander

Court had been discussed as possibly being changed to a two-way or have it go one-way in the other direction than what it currently is. Gallogly said that at present, there are difficulties getting out of the court and if the one-way was redirected, there could be problems getting in. He said having the court's operation remain the way it is would probably be good since it is such a "light street" and has angle parking, but he also said speaking with business and property owners along the court would be necessary to determine its future.

Johnson said Mary Alexander was the most difficult issue to tackle, and added that improving the flow along the street must be contemplated when considering its future operation.

HRC also suggested the channelization islands on Hutton near Dunlap Street should stay, but that the trees and shrubbery should be trimmed or replaced. Gallogly said in the near future the city will be removing or trimming a particularly large evergreen tree on the Hutton island so motorists would have better sight lines.

In addition, at the Main and Hutton intersection, HRC recom-

mended improving pedestrian and traffic signals. To do this, HRS stated the city should install a new four-faced traffic signal with a signal timing plan, as well as consider installing a pedestrian signal head across the north leg of the intersection, which would advise pedestrians if they had sufficient time to cross. Gallogly said the city does have planned improvements that address the recommendations for the intersection and they would occur next year. Johnson said he liked these particular recommendations because they seriously considered pedestrian flow at the intersection.

Other recommendations included improving crosswalk pavement markings throughout downtown with a standardized pattern and improving the maintenance schedule for the crosswalk pavement markings. HRC also recommended converting Hutton between Mary Alexander and Main to a two-way operation. Beublen gave a presentation on the benefits of have lighted crosswalks, which Gallogly said needed to be discussed further. He said many of the downtown crosswalks were already well-lit and the crosswalk lights may be too expensive.

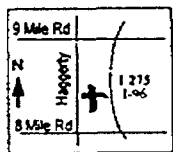

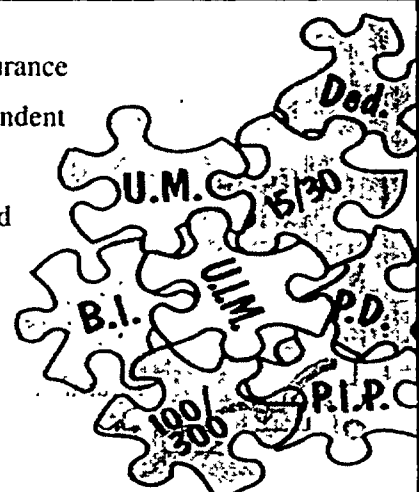

Police bust nets ecstasy, marijuana

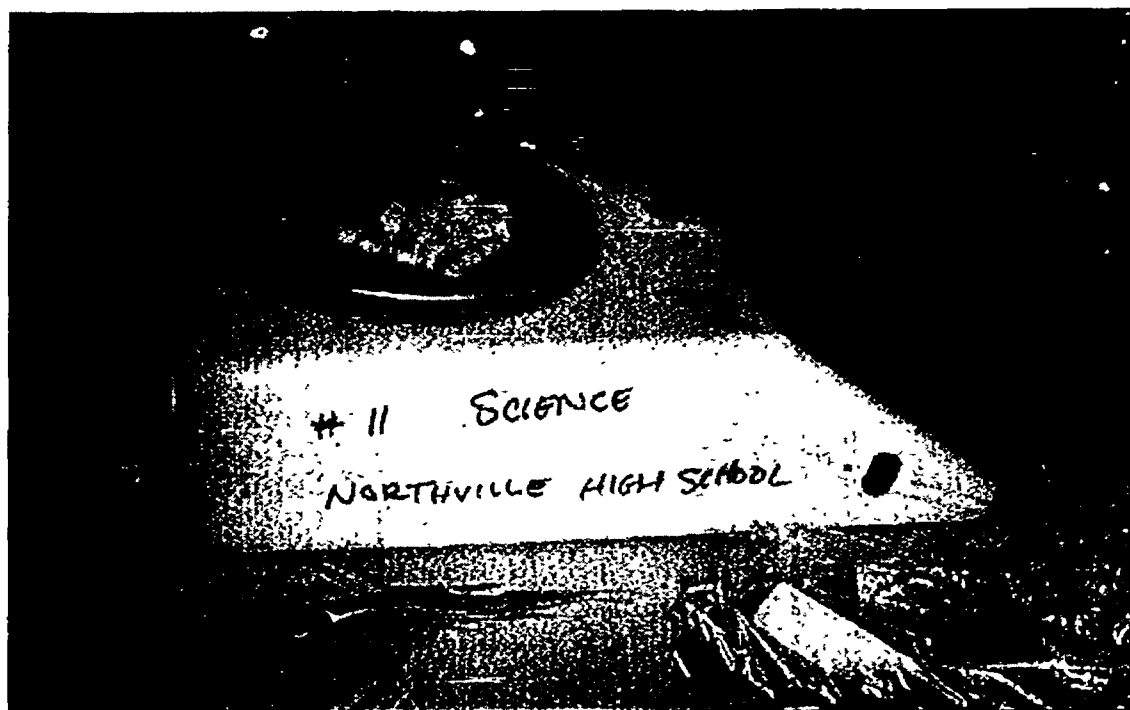

search warrant," Werth said. "The search warrant was substantiated and it was a successful operation."

Besides the ecstasy pills and marijuana, police seized \$540 that was inside the same nightstand drawer as some of the other items were retrieved from, as well as narcotic paraphernalia. Sumner said the assistance of Plymouth Township police officer Steve Cheston and his dog were very valuable because the dog successfully "hit upon" each location of the seized evidence.

Fendelet said the city has and will always work to assist the township if needed.

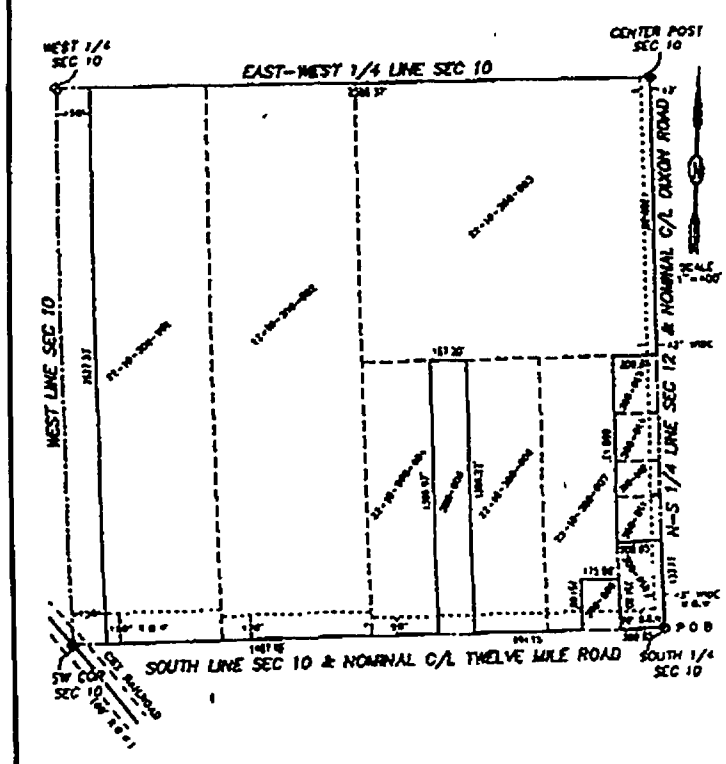

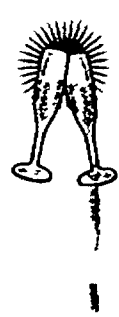

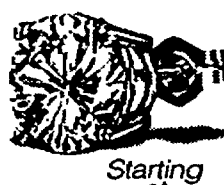

City works to bridge gaps in planning with joint meeting

On evening of Dec. 10, Northville city hall was the scene of future possibilities that could effect the coming development of the downtown area.

The city held a joint meeting that included the city council, planning commission, Downtown Development Authority and historic district commission for the purpose of presenting and preliminarily discussing several issues the groups share a common interest in.

"The purpose of this meeting was to expose you to some of the thoughts regarding the broader vision of downtown Northville," mayor Chris Johnson said to the commissioners at the end of the meeting.

Johnson said the groups needed to be creative when considering the future and should avoid being "locked into" ideas or notions on how the downtown would appear 20 years from now. He said the future planning needed to consider "what the community could be."

The first agenda item had Dick Beaubien of Hubbell, Roth and Clark presenting HRC's findings from the firm's recent downtown traffic study. Beaubien said the city wanted HRC to factor in pedestrian and vehicular traffic, safety, vehicular flow as well as the impact of a future post office expansion as they went ahead with the study. Beaubien gave four major recommendations:

- Prohibit left turns at Main and Center streets.

- Traffic signals are not needed on Cady Street.
- The trigger island on Hutton Street should stay.

- Mary Alexander Court should remain as it is currently.

DDA director Lori Ward then introduced the downtown conceptual development plan and said the charge for the plan's subcommittee was to examine possibilities for a Cady Street overlay district, downtown circulation, the Hutton Street area and development possibilities for the east end of Cady. DDA member Greg Presley went on to present the plan, which has five key concepts:

- Maintain and strengthen north-south pedestrian spine.
- Encourage development of small pedestrian public spaces and public art in downtown areas.
- Develop pedestrian linkages to neighborhoods, Ford Field, Northville Downs property and Edward Hines Park.
- Encourage mixed-use development consisting of commercial, office space and residential. Development should provide required parking, internal to development.
- Encourage development of on-street parking where feasible.

Presley said the subcommittee's

plan aimed to protect and promote the vitality of the downtown. He said he believed the proposed changes would enhance rather than harm Northville.

The final item discussed was the future of the DDA, including its boundaries and plan. Ward said expanding the boundaries would allow the DDA to have a proactive role in future development in the potentially effected areas as well as enabling the use of the DDA to help out the effected areas in financing potential projects. The plan pertains to the DDA's existence and Ward said by approving an extension of the DDA plan, it would enable the DDA to do such things as issue new bonds for

projects such as the construction of a parking deck and participate in proactive planning of added areas like Northville Downs.

City council member Kevin Hartsborne said a DDA expansion — specifically to the Downs property — could hinder the city in that if any development of the Downs occurred in the future, the city could lack the funding. At that point, the money could be sought from the DDA general fund to provide proper public services.

Planning commission chairperson Jay Wendt said other areas, such as the Good Time Party Store block, needed to be explored to be included in the

possible expansion. Ward said another location that could be included was the Northville Chamber of Commerce building.

Johnson concluded the meeting by expressing his thanks to those who worked on the agenda items and to those in attendance. He said the next step was for the groups to react to the information and offer suggestions.

"It will happen to us if we don't plan, or we can make it happen by planning," Johnson said of future downtown development. "Not many communities sit down and discuss their future. This demonstrates that we care about it so deeply."

Soccer group stays autonomous, kicks in insurance

Northville Soccer Association members have decided to remain independent and maintain the organization working in its current form, despite the challenges that lay ahead.

The NSA held a vote in November to decide whether it should come under the control of the Northville Parks and Recreation department or remain independent, but possibly contin-

ue the same relationship they had before with the recreation department. The rec department assisted the NSA with such project elements as registration and field maintenance. According to NSA's interim vice-president Peter Jabbour, the group's members elected to remain autonomous by more than 80 percent.

The vote came after volunteers dropped off because of a lawsuit involving the soccer organization and a Northville boy struck by lightning in May of 2000. The question of insurance liability

arose from the suit. Authorities in both the Northville Township and the city of Northville informed the NSA that if it would like to be covered by their respective insurance carriers, the NSA would have to come under the rec department's complete control.

"We anticipate to continue with the same type of relationship with the rec department," Jabbour said. "Representatives of NSA met with rec director Traci Sincok and things look promising."

At the November meeting, Sincok said the department

would wholeheartedly work with the NSA in any form its members decided upon. Jabbour said the rec department and the NSA would be drawing up a new letter of understanding very soon in order to clearly define the relationship.

Jabbour also said the NSA has secured insurance liability coverage and was looking to and was looking to enhance it.

"In order to fend off and overcome the fear of lawsuits and associated liabilities, we intend and are in the process of obtain-

ing insurance liability coverage for coaches and administrators involved with NSA," Jabbour said. "We already secured reasonable prices for \$1 million in coverage and are pursuing higher liability coverage possibilities. This should provide great comfort to all those involved in soccer and should also encourage volunteers to get back involved in soccer again."

Jabbour said volunteer help was still needed, but said the group did have enough volunteers to begin the spring 2002 season.

He said many volunteer positions were still available, including administrative help.

"We are very confident that NSA will overcome its past limitation and the challenges ahead, and continue to provide quality, safe and fun soccer for the 1,600 or so kids throughout the Northville community," Jabbour said.

New Victorian developers pencil in January for completion date

With the City of Northville still contemplating the Cambridge Place project, the New Victorian development is nearing completion.

Future development along Cady Street has the various city commissions thinking. The addition of The New Victorian at the corner of Church Street and Cady may be the first in a number of mixed-use developments along the street that

aim to give the south side of the downtown a facelift, as well as increasing the vitality of the area. According to New Victorian co-owner and Northville resident Linda Heaton, The New Victorian is the first of its kind in the downtown. The project is owned by Heaton and her husband, Terry, as well as Dennis Energer.

According to Heaton, the building will be a mix-use of residential and commercial space, and she said the Cady Church development

team's main intention for the project is to provide a quality that will enhance the scope of the downtown.

"We are very much looking forward to getting it finished," Heaton said of the early January tentative completion date. "We have all kinds of interest from possible tenants ranging from attorneys to deli owners. The first floor will be leaseable for service or office related tenants while the second and third floors will be for sale for residential."

The commercial space has three suites available, two with 1,650 square feet and the third has 2,000 square feet. Heaton said the commercial space has quality construction throughout and is pre-wired for telephone, cable and high-speed Internet access. She also said the space will have soaring ceiling heights and south facing windows. There will be on-site and off-site parking available.

There will only be eight condominium units available to buy that will range in size from 1,300 square feet to 1,600. Heaton said the condos have a spacious master suite, a guest room, up to 9-foot ceiling heights and designated covered parking space as well as an additional space for guests.

Heaton said the major task left for the builders to do is to install the elevator, which just recently

arrived.

"We believe The New Victorian will only help add to the health of the downtown by bringing needed residential and commercial opportunities to it," Heaton said.

Shooting suspects found in Northville

Wolverine Lake man wounded twice in apparent drug transaction gone bad

Two suspects are being arraigned after they allegedly shot a 20-year-old man who supposedly owed the men money in a Wolverine Lake home.

Police

The victim, who was shot in his abdomen and elbow Dec. 17 about 3 p.m., called police from

the 1200 block of Lakeview Street where the shooting occurred.

According to Wolverine Lake police chief Joe George, the victim knew his assailants. The men drove off in a newer model purple Ford Explorer.

"It (allegedly) had to do with money being owed," George said. "It has all the looks of a drug transaction not being paid. I don't think it was a lot. I think it was a minimal amount."

The man is currently in stable condition, George said.

The men were found and arrested late Monday evening in two different cities. A 19-year-old suspect, a Commerce Township resident, was found in Northville at a friend's house with the help of Northville police.

The other suspect, 17, was found at his Novi residence.

"There was a lot of hard work by a number of different agencies," George said.

Wixom, Novi and Northville Police Departments assisted in finding the men, he said. Wolverine Lake, Walled Lake and

the Oakland County Sheriff's Department did a lot of the "leg work".

"It was a great piece of work by everyone involved to get them off the street as quickly as we did," George said.

The arraignment on Dec. 19 takes place after the Northville Record went to press.

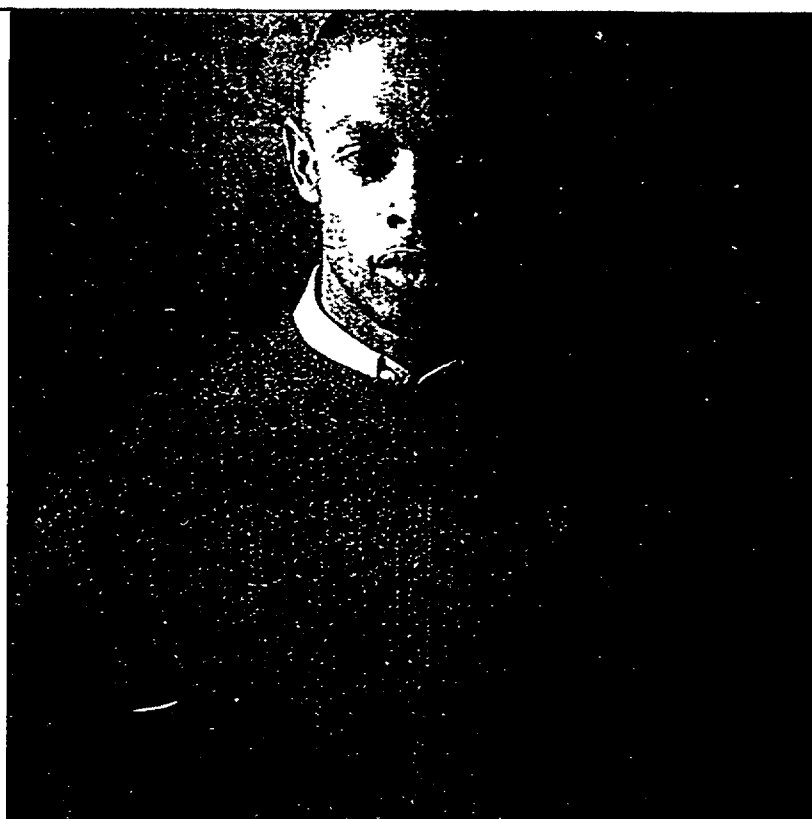

City: Cambridge to remain on hold until January

whelming. Presley and Johnson both pointed to the building's appearance of having three separate facades to offset its mass. Presley also said the architectural quality, including high quality materials, would give it a high-caliber appearance at every angle.

To meet ordinance requirements, the project would be required to supply 206 parking spaces. However, it is providing 127 parking spaces on site and creating 19 spaces off-site. Cambridge would have to pay for 79 non-existent sites in order to meet the city requirement.

Two Center Street property owners said because of a parking shortage individuals in the future may be using their spaces. They also

said the access point off of Center was a mere "alley" and not adequate to be a proper ingress or egress point. The store owners also felt the project would only add to the present traffic volume problem on Center, which many residents said is already out of control during rush morning and afternoon hours.

Presley said he believed the ingress and egress were satisfactory, and he also pointed out that the project design was adjusted by having the building setback 10 feet from Cady in order to provide parallel parking along Cady. Presley said parallel parking was one design aspect the city wanted to see. He also said vehicular circulation and the increase in traffic flow was an issue that needed to be dealt with by the city commissions in the near future, even if

Cambridge was not built.

Proponents of the project pointed out the benefits Cambridge would bring to the downtown, such as its mixed-use purpose that could bring an increase in downtown consumers and its public amenities that would help add to the pedestrian north-south linkage. That linkage is favored by the downtown development authority.

Resident Chuck Lapham said the complaints he was hearing about Cambridge Place were strikingly similar to those with the MainCentre complex when it was developed. Lapham said he didn't believe the criticisms were warranted because he believed the mixed-use aspect of the project had many benefits and the increase in traffic lately could be the result of construction work on

other area roads as well as a growing Northville Township population.

"We have something unique," Lapham said of downtown Northville. "We have to keep adding to it and quality development on Cady will only help our future."

After the public hearing, Hartshorne said each time the project has come back it has gotten bigger. He said the traffic impact must be considered before a final decision can be made. He also reiterated the concerns over height and mass as well as parking. Ayers then said the residential aspect is the most important element to the project and was a very valuable asset for the vitality of downtown.

Mittman and council member

Thomas Swigart, both expressed their concern on the height and the precedent it would set for further Cady development.

Johnson said traffic was a vital ingredient to a vital downtown, and said 20 years ago the downtown did not have a traffic problem, but the downtown has also positively grown because of the traffic increase. He said the downtown "won't stay the way we are."

After Hartshorne made his motion, Cambridge's Mark Guidobono reminded council members of the changes and modifications made to please the city, such as adding a public plaza, a pedestrian route right through the building, purchasing property from Northville Downs for landscaping and offsetting the building for on-street parking. He said

those things added expense to the cost of development — costs, he said, which could be recovered best by selling or leasing property from a fifth floor in Cambridge.

Guidobono also said the mixed-use aspect is the greatest asset the project will bring.

"I think Cambridge Place will enhance, not change the face of downtown Northville," Guidobono said. "I care about the downtown as much as anyone in this room."

Johnson said the Cambridge planners needed to go back and address the council's concerns before returning in January.

35th district on tap for addition of 3rd judge

ship would be needed very soon. He said the average case load for a district court judge should be around 13,000 per year, but he said 35th District judges have been averaging 23,000 cases. The large numbers were backed up by the State Court Administrative Office's analysis as well.

According to the SCAO, an additional judge is needed at the 35th because the district's population

increased by 21 percent between 1990-1998 and is expected to grow by another 14 percent over the next 10 years. The SCAO study also concluded the filings per judge at the 35th was at least 59 percent higher than the statewide average.

"We wholeheartedly support the addition of a third judge," Northville Township police chief John Werth said. "It's badly needed."

All parties seem to agree that after the new facility was built the

arrival of a third judge was just a matter of time.

"The new courthouse facility was built to have a third judgeship, so there is not a problem of accommodating one," Patterson said.

The SCAO study also agreed with Patterson's sentiment by stating the new facility is built with four judicial courtrooms and can accommodate further expansion. One of the courtrooms is used by the court's magistrates.

As it stands now, Patterson said

the process was moving along "nicely" and said he didn't anticipate encountering any obstacles. If Engler signs the measure, an election would be held next November with the winner taking office in January of 2003. The judge would be serving an 8-year term.

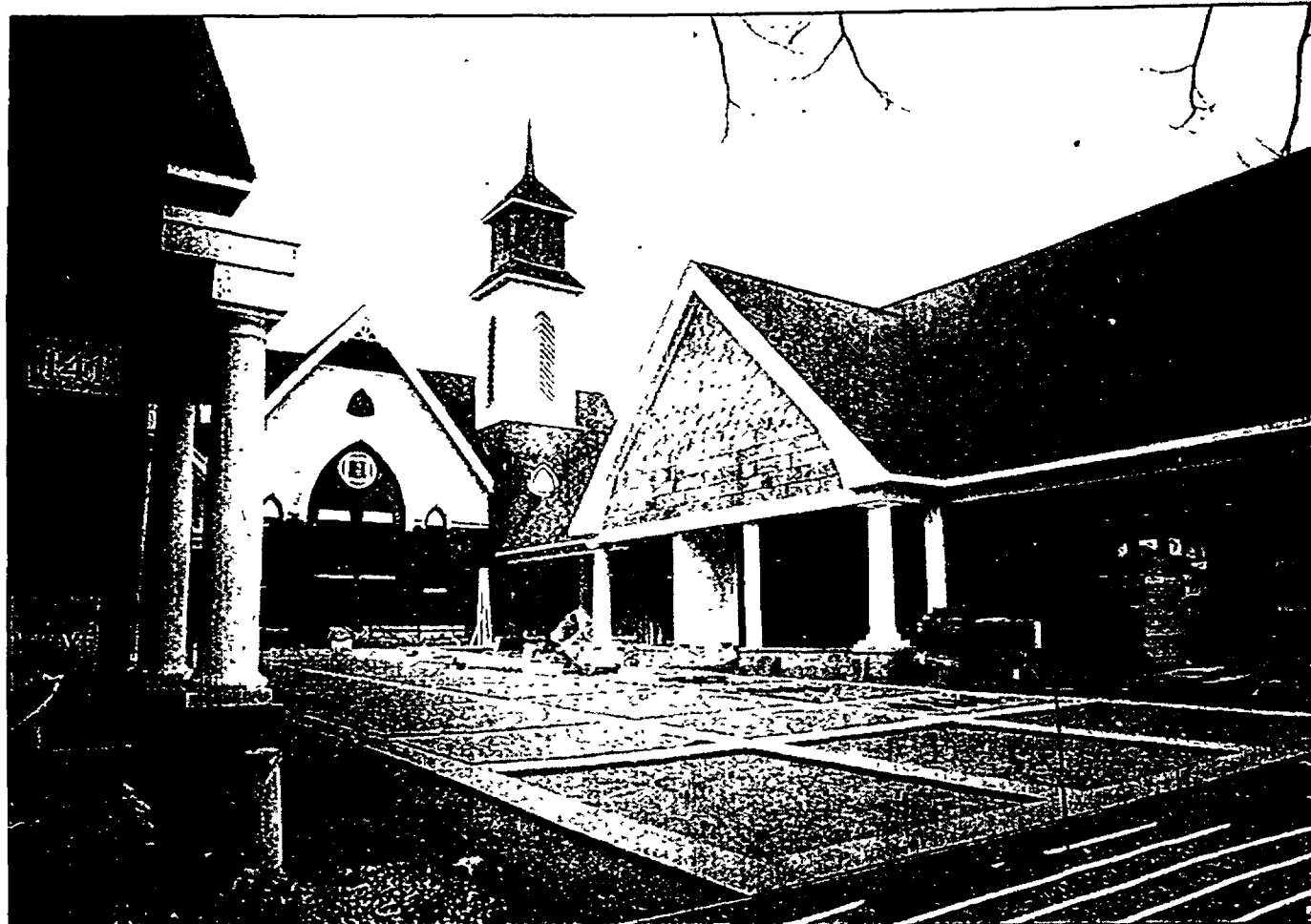

Ahh, that quirky regent issue

'Tis the season, and just in time for the New Year, they're changing the guard at the University of Michigan.

Leaving (for the presidency of Columbia University) is Lee Bollinger, who was a popular and visionary leader at the U-M during his relatively short tenure. Arriving as Interim President is B. Joseph White, the respected former dean of the Business School.

Bollinger's departure from the U-M has been the subject of intense speculation, some having to do with his compensation (substantially less than football coach Lloyd Carr) and some having to do with the workings and personalities on the eight-member Board of Regents. Bollinger has been giving end-of-term interviews to various newspapers, not directly criticizing the board but suggesting it could benefit from additional perspective to do its job better, perhaps through a visiting committee made up of alumni and other friends and donors to the University.

In an interview published last week in the *Ann Arbor News*, Bollinger said, "Every great institution has people other than the formal governing board who devote a good segment of their lives and their energies to the success of their institution, and who bring to those discussions very special tal-

ents and capacities. We do not have that."

He suggested the essentially political process that produces the governing boards of the Michigan's Big Three universities may not always produce the best boards to govern universities.

"If you tried to run this university like a department of transportation or a business, it would be a disaster. ... These are fragile places, with a very distinctive culture and intellectual atmosphere. ... A sense of some disconnection from the pressures of political and commercial problems is essential," said Bollinger.

For years, many have argued that the odd way we select members of university governing boards in Michigan could stand improvement. Most voters have no idea of the qualifications and positions of candidates. As a result, who gets elected is essentially a crapshoot. Perhaps that's why very few other states elect members of their university boards.

Gov. Engler says he wants to appoint board members, perhaps subject to confirmation. Senator John Schwarz says a better system would be to add seven appointed members to the eight-member elected boards, thereby producing a hybrid board of 15. In either case, changing the way boards are selected in Michigan would require amending the Constitution, not an easy matter.

So maybe Bollinger's idea of an advisory visiting committee has some merit. I saw a version work well while I served as a Regent.

Farris Womack, then the financial vice president of the University, created an investment advisory committee to advise him in managing the U-M's portfolio, stocking it with business and investment heavy-

weights. The advisory board had two purposes. One was to advise the vice president about investments. The other was to educate individual members of the board about the complexities of financial and investment strategy.

Everything worthwhile has a hidden agenda, of course. And the hidden agenda in this case was to intimidate into silence one particularly obtuse and unknowing regent who had a long history of trying to micromanage investment decisions. Watching Al Taubman blantly tell this guy he didn't know what he was talking about is one of my happiest memories of my time as a Regent! And — surprise! — pretty soon that regent quit messing with investment decisions.

The people who serve as U-M regents put in an enormous amount of unpaid time and effort for the University, and they never get much credit for their all their work and caring. Most of them, in my experience, have been unusually able and dedicated men and women. But like any other small board — especially one that is the product of the political system — they need all the help and advice they can get.

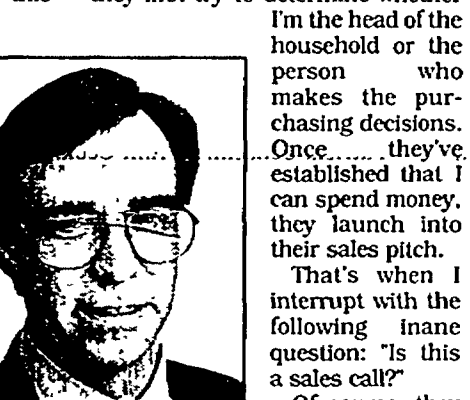
Obviously, the regents won't want to dilute their responsibilities in governing the University. But having available to them a group of experienced people who also care deeply for the U-M might give them some valuable perspective and balance.

Dealing with the pesky telemarketers

Despite what a lot of people seem to think, telemarketers do indeed serve a purpose. I, for one, find that on any given boring day, telemarketers can provide me with a few moments of comic relief.

The conversation goes something like this — they first try to determine whether

I'm the head of the household or the person who makes the purchasing decisions. Once they've established that I can spend money, they launch into their sales pitch.

That's when I interrupt with the following inane question: "Is this a sales call?"

Of course, they always deny it. "No sir, this is just a courtesy call intended to offer you the opportunity to obtain ABC service or XYZ product for the special low price of only ..." Then I can have a little fun arguing with them about whether it is indeed actually a sales call.

The lucky few get the benefit of a quick education from one of my lectures espousing my limited knowledge of business.

"Doing business requires a certain level of trust," I tell them. This is usually met with a stunned silence from the other end of the phone line. "You can't sell me something if you don't believe that I'll pay you for it. I can't buy something if I don't believe you'll give me the product or service I'm paying for. So how can I trust you enough to do business with you when you can't

even be honest enough with me to admit that this is in fact a sales call?"

Of course, most of the time, I can't waste the time and just hang up. I'm not polite about it. I don't explain why I don't want their product. I don't say goodbye. I just hang up.

But at other times, when I'm really feeling grumpy, the telemarketer offers me a very convenient target for venting my frustrations. I have been known to abuse telemarketers so severely that they hang up on me.

Here's the most important point. I never ever buy from a telephone solicitor. After all, it's a business and it relies on making sales. Yes, telemarketers can get by with a really low percentage of sales to overall calls, but ultimately the success of the business relies on making at least an occasional sale.

By making sure I never buy from a caller, I find that I get fewer and fewer of these calls all the time.

So I am somewhat baffled by all the concern over supposed invasions of people's evening hours by telephone solicitations. Just how much time does it take to hang up on somebody?

Nonetheless, state lawmakers are working on a five-bill package intended to crack down on telemarketing. The main bill, House Bill 4042 sponsored by Rep. Jennifer Faunce, R-Warren, would create a statewide "do not call list" for state residents who want to block such intrusions. Telemarketers themselves argue the bills may violate their First Amendment right to free speech, and that is a point worth considering. But many lawmakers also contend that the bills will do little for Michigan phone users. For one, a state do-not-call list will do nothing to block calls from out-

of state firms. Nor will it likely stop unscrupulous telemarketers who choose to ignore the law.

Last week, state senators decided to scrap the initiation of a do-not-call list and replaced the bill with a version of legislation that simply prohibits telemarketers from blocking their identity on caller ID systems and the "69" option. This is an even worse idea, because if any telemarketer decides to violate the law, consumers will have no way to complain about them. How will they know what company decided to block its identity when making calls?

Nonetheless,

that version won approval of the senate 22-11, which sent the bill back to the House for concurrence.

It all seems to me rather pointless, a waste of lawmakers' time, when consumers already have in their hands the most potent weapon there is against telemarketing ... the disconnect switch.

Curing more than simple back pain

electromyography detects abnormal muscle function. A thermal scan helps identify nerve interference and problem areas and measures the temperature along the spine. And another step includes a posture analysis.

It's an important key to overall health, says Dr. Klapp.

"When you have posture problems, it can work your muscles up to six times more."

The purpose of all of this is to see how the spine is affecting your overall health. It's a misconception to think that chiropractic care only treats back problems, he points out. Other health problems that can possibly be helped include headaches, allergies even carpal tunnel syndrome. 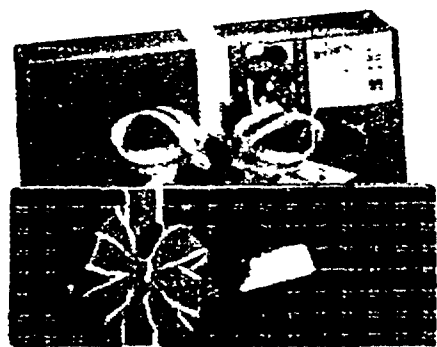

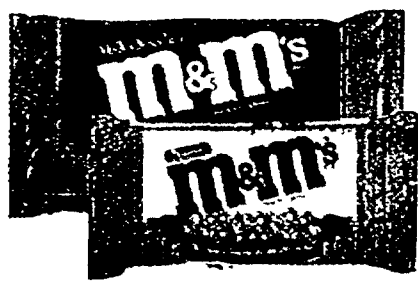

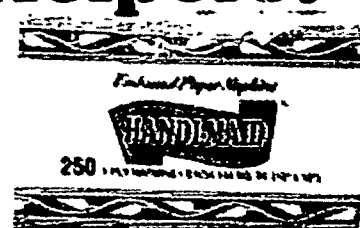

Swimmers collect wins

Tankers beat Farmington, South Lyon

They may be small, but they can make waves with the best of them.

The Northville Mustangs boys' swim team, consisting of 15 swimmers and three divers, showcased their abilities as they dominated the South Lyon 115-71 Dec. 11 before topping Farmington in a Western Lakes Activities Association contest Dec. 13. Just two days later, the small but feisty group of Mustangs competed in the WLAA relay meet and placed seventh.

"We were only able to fill eight of the relays," swim coach Rich Bennetts said of the swim team's small numbers. "Seventh overall isn't too bad when there were two events we couldn't even compete in."

Divers Jason Albosta and John Campbell took second in the diving portion of the relay meet for their own medals.

"I felt that the kids did really well," Bennetts said.

The Mustangs will get two and a half weeks of rest from competition before they take on North Farmington next year.

"We are going to get some good training in over the holidays," Bennetts said. "We will be training

everyday except Christmas and New Year's. We will be getting into the two-a-days. It is a tough time as far as training for the guys, but there is a lot of team building things that we do. It is real important for these guys to come together and realize they can rely on each other."

The Mustangs collected their second win of the season Dec. 13 as they topped the Farmington Falcons.

The Mustangs trailed the Falcons 40-22 midway through the meet, but the team managed to come together and win it.

"The guys just came together and held them off," Bennetts said. "We were hurting and our divers came in first, second and third and then we came out a completely different team."

The Mustangs collected first-place finishes in the 200 freestyle with Lunn capturing the top spot in 1:59.73.

The crew that turned the meet around were divers Albosta (first, 222 points), Campbell (second, 184) and freshman Dan Talke.

"They are a strong part of our team," Bennetts said.

The Mustangs followed Maxim to a first-place finish in the 100 butterfly with a time of 1:05.95 and then looked to Lunn again for a first in the 500 freestyle with 5:17.37. The 100 freestyle event found Mike Yutzy taking first with 1:13.72 before he combined with Carter.

Penalties just don't pay.

The Northville Mustangs' ice hockey team took the brunt of another loss as the team fell to Farmington 8-2 in a Western Lakes Activities Association contest Saturday.

The team collected 16 penalties, most of which coach Jeff Bond said were careless ones, at that.

The biggest downside to racking up the minutes is the amount of time the Falcons spent on power plays.

"Once you are in the penalty box there isn't much you can do," Bond said. "Right here we have a minimum of 32 minutes in the box, of our team playing short-handed. That's over half the game. You can't expect to win like that."

The penalties were an issue Bond said would be addressed at the team's practices.

"There is definitely something I am going to address in practice," he said. "When you add up all of our penalty minutes there are four players that are the common denominator. The first step [in stopping penalties] is to talk about

"Lindsey Carlson took a first on vault with a 9.0," Schultz said. "She also tied for first on the bars with a 9.15 with Sara Wolchowski."

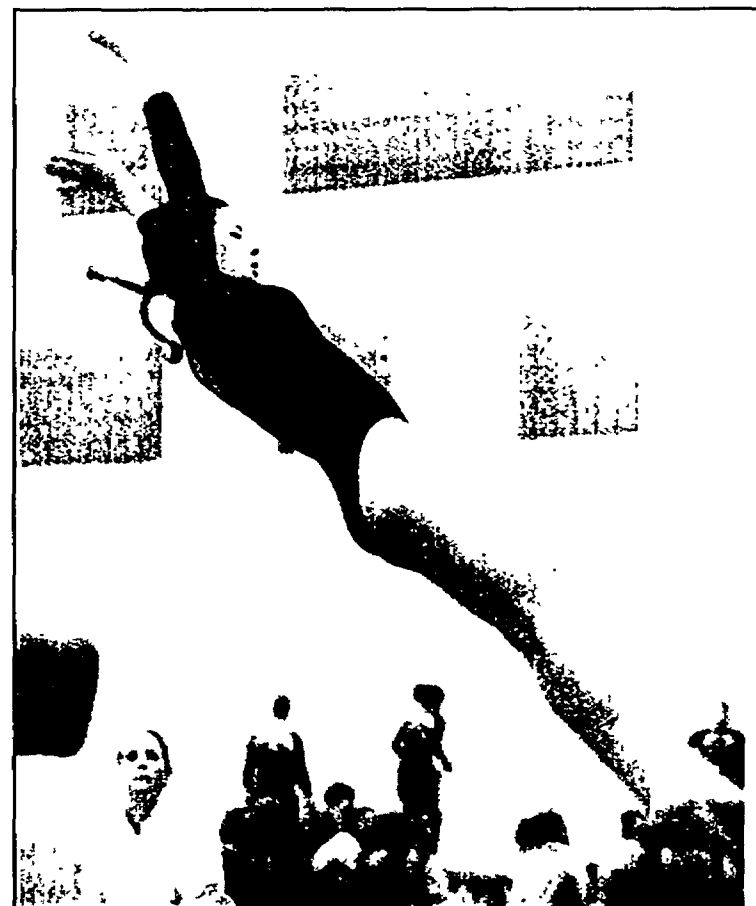

When "Skeeter" LaClair and Jim Presley got it going, Milford had one of the KVC's most dangerous teams. He ran the option like a 1980s Big 8 quarterback. With LaClair, a two-year starter, under center the Redskins turned in their first winning season in over 20 years. A first-team All-KVC selection, he rushed for 770 yards and 10 touchdowns.

Stu Utley South Lyon Jr TE

In South Lyon's conservative offense obviously the majority of a tight end's duties involve blocking. While Utley did that, he also emerged as a legitimate pass-catching threat. When Gasparella did throw the ball the majority of the time it was going to this sure-handed senior. Utley caught 19 balls for 311 yards and five touchdowns.

Defense

Scott Kortlandt Novi SR Linebacker

Don't even bother trying to run the ball through senior linebacker Scott Kortlandt. A fierce football player as well as a wrestler, Kortlandt knows

the physics of leverage and will punish running backs who think they can just lower a shoulder to get past him. Kortlandt is a leader with both actions and knowledge and was a key element in the Wildcat defense.

Adam Dilley Northville SR Linebacker

Even a broken foot couldn't keep Adam Dilley from being one of the leading tacklers on the Northville defense. Dilley's ability to make the big play and his field awareness made him a difficult player to run against or throw at. His speed and strength were just part of the reason he often led in tackles.

Chase Chandler Novi JR Defensive Back

Tested often but not beaten often, Chase Chandler proved to be a valuable asset for the Novi Wildcats. His speed and jumping ability made him a tough defensive back to throw against and his sure hands made interceptions with ease.

Ken Rimatzki Lakeland Sr LB

Rimatzki turned in the fourth-most prolific defensive season in Lakeland history with his 87 tackles. 37 were solo. He also recovered two fumbles and blocked one kick. A first-team All-KVC selection, Rimatzki was voted Lakeland's top linebacker and defensive player.

Jordan Robertson South Lyon Sr LB

While teammate Dave Williamson, a junior, emerged as an all-conference linebacker Robertson remained the player that teams ran away from. Even if it didn't always work, this big kid's speed in pursuit up and down the line showed why he remained a likely Division I prospect despite what many considered a subpar season. On the other side of the ball, Robertson started in South Lyon's offensive backfield for the third-straight season, where he ran for 465 yards and six touchdowns.

Eric Ziem Milford Sr LB

The reigning HomeTown East baseball player of the year, Ziem got it done on the gridiron as well. He led the Redskins defense with 80 tackles, 54 of those solo.

Matt Kujala Lakeland LB

Kujala's 82 tackles (29 solo) are the sixth-most in one season in Lakeland history. He recovered one fumble and had one sack. Kujala was first-team All-KVC.

Peter Busciglio WLW SR Down Lineman

An effective pass rusher and a top-notch defender on the run is what makes Busciglio a key element in the Warriors defense.

team's leading tackler no matter if a speed prefers to pass or run. Ducat's team and outstanding strength make an unstoppable force with the ability to make the lay on any part of the playing field.

Barima Opong-Owusu WLW SR Linebacker

B.J. Opong-Owusu is one of the staples of the Walled Lake Western defensive backfield. His field presence and awareness make him one of the top tacklers in the WLAA. A solid tackler with the ability to read the play, Opong-Owusu has the talent and aggressiveness needed in linebackers.

Tim Downing Northville SOPH Defensive Back
