'We're working like crazy'

for the new elementary school to be built on Six Mile Road.

District takes next step in planning for building projects


Northville school officials are well bond projects which were approved by voters in September.

Additions for the Northville school district will include a new elementary school, expansions to Winchester Elementary, Moraine Elementary and Northville High School as well as two storage additions at Amerman Elementary.

Furthermore, the district is implementing wide-area network cabling to the new elementary school and the establishment of a redundant loop to complete the district's technology structure.

David Bolitho, assistant superintendent for Northville Public Schools, said multiple design teams have been tackling the steps in initiating the building process.

He said there is a design team in place for each of the buildings involved in the 2001 bond issue. All of the teams follow the same



procedures adopted by the school board in developing new additions or new buildings, he said.

At Amerman Elementary school, two storage room additions have been planned and are slated to be completed by August 2002.

I'd like to see them done by the start of school next year," said

He also said the storage rooms have been programmed based on the items that will need to be stored there. Items such as cafeteria tables, equipment, chairs and supplies will be stowed in these

Moraine Elementary will also see

a number of changes in the months

Bolitho said the south centrum at Moraine will be redone. New four classrooms, an artroom and a music room. The projects are scheduled to be completed by August 2003, but may be completed sooner, Bolitho said.

Right now, we are finalizing design development for Moraine. We will be finished by Feb. 13," Bolitho said, adding that the district has to be finished with all design development work by that deadline for all the projects before

actual construction can begin. Our goal is to have every school completed for the 2001 bond issue by August 2003, when the new elementary school opens," said Bolitho. "Some will be done before

Northville High School will also be expanded as a result of voter approval.

Nanovation latest fatality on Five Mile

Despite the company's hopes for successful restructuring. Nanovation Technologies appears to be no more.

According to public affairs spokesperson Paul Krebs of the' Michigan Economic Development Corporation, the last piece of information the MEDC obtained and could provide on Nanovation was that in November of 2001, the MEDC became aware Nanovation was auctioning off all of its equipment from its Northville Township

The MEDC had offered to help Nanovation on the belief that Nanovation would create new jobs.

According to Northville Township finance director and assistant manager Thelma Kubitskey, the township finance department has filed a Jeopardy tax for Nanovation. She said filing a jeopardy tax gave the township the authority to file a lien against Nanovation's personal property taxes for the company's current year if it did not reimburse the township for taxes owed. The action has also been issued for Hayes Lemmerz International, which had also recently declared

Chapter 11 bankruptcy.

Representatives of Nanovation

could not be reached or would not comment on the company's current status.

Late last July, Nanovation had filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy protection and cut the jobs of 120 of its 169 employees at the Northville facility. At the time. Nanovation corporate communications vice-president Melanie Ofenloch said there was a strong possibility of a successful restructuring.

That possibility appeared to be vanquished, though, when a personal visit by Northville Record reporters to Nanovation's Five Mile Road facility bore no fruit. In fact, a "For Sale" sign could be seen on the facility's property.

'it doesn't appear as if they will be coming back to life any time soon," Krebs said of Nanovation.

Nanovation had moved to Northville from Miami in the summer of 2000 and occupied the same building that housed OIS
Optical Imaging Systems Inc.,
which also filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy the previous year. Nanovation used photonics and utilized photons rather than electrons to power the equipment it produced. Nanovation developed manufactured extremely

A \$5,000 grant will help give Northville and Plymouth youths an opportunity to show off their skateboarding skills in the near future.

The Michigan Recreation and Parks Association and the Department Michigan Community Health awarded the grant to the Northville Parks and Recreation Department and to the city of Plymouth Parks and Recreation Department as a part of its "Get Michigan Youth Moving program. According to Northville's Recreation supervisor Nichole Haskins, the two recreation departments have plans to use the grant funds to assist in

the purchase of a portable skate park to be shared by both community programs.

Blueprint for success means learning about architecture at school

Fashioning Victorian-style homes normally isn't part of school curriculum, but students at Hillside Middle School have handcrafted several model houses as part of a unique classroom project.

We did a unit on architecture, said Debbie Arindaeng, an academic resource teacher at Hillside. We focused in on styles from the Victorian Era. There were six popular styles during that era."

Arindaeng sald her students were divided into small groups and each group was given a certain house style to recreate.

They had to first design the house on paper for that style [and]





Postal service holds off on Northville office project

Some may blame the current stalemate on the United States Postal Services' projects on last year's anthrax scare and the current national recession.

However, postal officials said such projects as the Northville Post Office expansion were on hold prior to the problems faced

According to Detroit post office communications manager Ed Moore, the standstill on the Northville expansion is due to a

known for some time.

There is currently a capital spending freeze on all postal projects across the nation and this freeze has existed for a year at least." Moore said. "However, we have not forgotten the Northville project and once the freeze is lifted it will be one of the leading projects to be undertaken."

The possibility of the Northville post office expansion had drawn the ire of many Northville city residents who believed it would infringe on their neighborhoods. especially the Wing Street area.

financial situation that has been The office is located on Wing and a previous expansion plan had the office expanding to nearly three times its current size. However, the plan may have taken a turn when the Northville Township board of trustees offered the post office a plot of property on Seven Mile Road for the larger distribution center with the condition that the retail center and primary residential postal location would be kept in downtown Northville.

To placate residents' fears of not knowing what was going on with the project, mayor Chris Johnson established an ad hoc committee fully lessen the deficit. He also

involving residents and city and township officials. The group has not met since last fall because of the spending freeze, city manager Gary Word said. Word said since no planning has occurred and no more is expected in the next 90 days, the group will be inactive until such time.

Moore said the postal service has experienced a financial deficit, which is the primary reason behind the freeze. He said the halt on projects and reducing employee work hours will be two ways in which the postal service will hopesaid he did not know how long the freeze would last.

Staff members at the Northville post office don't expect their operations to change much with the latest freeze announcement.

We are, and have been, dealing with it for the last few years." Northville post office supervisor Dave Priebe said of the overcrowding working environment. "We have learned to adjust by rearranging the operations for the clerks and carriers. We can't make it bigger, so we will work on as

Moore said across the nation,

many small town post offices that have experienced growth in the last 10 years such as Northville - have not adjusted their offices to meet the population increase. He said it was a testament of the work ethic of the Northville office to be able to "juggle" its equipment and responsibilities to provide a proper serv-





Students build future cities MIII Race Matters

When it comes to building and designing a city of the future, a group of Hillside Middle School students initiated a few award-winning ideas for their concept water city.

Four students - Stephanie Lin. Stephanie Bommarito, Dan Dulzo and Jake Hoemschemeyer —participated in a Future Cities Competition for the Michigan Region on Jan. 23 in Dearborn.

Debbie Arindaeng, an academic resource teacher at Hillside Middle School, said the competition was open to students in grades 7 and 8 and is primarily designed for students who have an interest in engineering.

The four-person team created an underwater city, called Wasserstadt. and engineered their city to be powered by harnessed lightning. Transportation was accomplished by compressed air.

What they have to do is design a city of the future," said Arindaeng. They have to consider communication, energy needs, transportation, way of life and trash disposal."

She also said the students had to follow a budget, produce a computerized model, write an essay, prepare a presentation and finally, construct their city.

The Hillside team won an award for the most improved quality of life, Arindaeng said.

"They did extremely well," she said. "It was their first year ever doing this." Arindaeng acted as the team's sponsor and the team also worked with an engineer mentor.

"The kids did great," she said. "They came through. They were extremely competitive considering they were a first year team."

Approximately 30 schools from around the state rivaled in the com-

Arindaeng said the judges, who had engineering backgrounds, were looking for several crucial elements within the students' cities.

They're looking for innovative and creative ideas from the kids," she said, adding that judges questioned certain aspects of the cities.

They really put the kids on the spot," said Arindaeng. "They really need to understand the science behind their ideas."



Bolitho said the high school's addition is planned to accommodate 400 more students.

We wanted to make the general classrooms mirror images of what was constructed two years ago," he said. "We needed to add other rooms based upon program need."

In addition, an extensive broadcast studio will be constructed at the high school.

These projects are expected to be finished in 2003.

Along with new additions to Amerman Elementary, Moraine Elementary and Northville High School, new classrooms will be also be constructed at Winchester Elementary. The renovations at Winchester are planned to be completed by August 2002.

Lastly, voters approved the district's plan to build a sixth elementary school, which will be located near the Six Mile and Ridge Road intersection.

Bolitho said the design team for the new elementary school has 16 subcommittees working to plan the layout and design of the building. The team faced such decisions as selecting cabinetry, paint, loose furniture equipment, fabrics, tile, carpet and choosing other interior

According to school officials, the new elementary would accommodate the projected peak enrollment and would be of adequate size to implement the board of education's lowered class size targets.

Bolitho said the design teams have faced a laborious task in devising the most suitable learning environment.

We have been working like crazy on this," said Bolitho.



The biggest test passed, Cambridge moves ahead

By Lon Huhman

The second reading and possible adoption to amend the Northville city zoning ordinance to provide for planned-unit development zoning for Cambridge Place still remains, but Cambridge planners have a plan on how to proceed.

We will be going back before the historic district commission in order to have them finalize the building's colors," Cambridge planner Mark Guidobono said of one of the next steps. They have already approved the colors in concept."

Cambridge design architect Greg Presley said the 113,578 square foot building will be designed and eventually constructed in such way that it will appear to be three, distinct buildings. Guidobono said there will be three different brick colors for each section.

Simultaneously, the planners will begin to design the floor plan for the five-story mixed-use development that is intended to be built on Cady Street. The project is proposed to be three stories of residential use and two stories of commercial and office space. Guidobono said it could take two to three months to complete the floor

Another eventual step will be the marketing aspect of the project that will begin this year.

Guidobono said Cambridge will set up a sales center at location on Center Street. The sales center will have a model of the kitchen and bath facilities on display. Guidobono said the step in the presale mode will give potential buyers an idea of what Cambridge's owner-occupied condominiums will look like.

According to city manager Gary Word, there are several remaining issues to be worked out, the largest being the city-mandated reverter clause in the PUD agreement, as well as in the sales and development agreement. Northville officials mandated the clause in the event Cambridge didn't materialize.

The purpose of the reverter clause is to have the property reverted back to the city. Word said

because the city is required to pay Northville Downs Racetrack \$136,823 for selling land the land purposes other than public parking, the city is requiring Cambridge to repay the city in the like amount should the property be reverted to the city in the event of default. Cambridge has not agreed to the clause.

However, Guidobono said Cambridge would agree to a clause. but needed to tweak the wording of the clause before an agreement could be reached.

PUD extension is another issue that may be ongoing until the project is completed. Word said Cambridge has indicated the project will require advance marketing and pre-commitments for occupancy before construction can begin. Cambridge planners have stated actual construction is not likely to begin for at least one to two years from approval. Since the PUD ordinance provides that construction shall be commenced within one year following approval. Cambridge will need to return to the planning commission at least once for an extension of the PUD prior to con-

small, all-optical switches, controls and measuring devices that were supposed to speed up broadband networks being developed for Internet traffic.

Prior to the bankruptcy filing. employee layoffs and reorganization process. Nanovation believed it had secured \$10 million from Motorola Inc. as the lead investment in a \$75 million private offering of new preferred stock. However, the investment deal needed stockholder approval, but could not get it once the company's major stockholder - Toronto-based Stamford International Inc. legally barred it. Stamford had

Nanovation was supposed to receive a \$9.7 million tax credit from the Michigan Economic Growth Authority based on the promise that it would invest \$41 million in the plant and create 539 jobs. However, Krebs said this was

a conditional offer and if the company did create the jobs they would not be eligible. Krebs said as far as he was aware, Nanovation did not receive the credit.

The company had secured funding to continue their operations on a limited basis after the bankruptcy filing. At the time of the filing, Ofenloch said Nanovation's assets were at \$48 million and their liabilities were at \$28 million.





Five Mile and Beck: Is this place cursed?

In the last three years, two highlytouted businesses have fallen on hard times, and a third is in the intensive financial care ward. Nanovation has packed up and left Northville Township without a word — the same Nanovation that replaced OIS Optical Imaging Systems that hit the wall and was recruited to replace the large research and development facility. Hayes Lemmerz Meanwhile, International has filed Chapter 11 bankruptcy. While this isn't a sign of imminent disaster, it doesn't take an MBA to know that bankruptcy regardless of the form - isn't a good

It may be tempting to blame these three companies' hard times on the recession, but doing so wouldn't wholly correct. Problems for OIS, Nanovation and Hayes Lemmerz started long before the recession, and even pre-Sept. 11. Certainly, the Trade Center / Pentagon attacks and economic cooldown didn't help, but the culpability doesn't solely rest with

those sources, either, 12514 There's something deeper going on here, and whatever it is, isn't good.

Northville Township authorities have often stated their interest in attracting R&D firms to the community. If they're effective, they bring high-paying jobs, are relatively easy on the environment, don't hoard land, and contribute greatly to the community's tax base.

The operative phrase here: "if they're effective."

Therein lies the problem. They

Here's the million-dollar question: haven't been effective. And regardless of the reasons behind the shutdowns and bankruptcies, don't think for a second that their problems won't have an impact on life in Northville Township. Eleven jobs have officially been cut from Hayes Lemmerz. Who knows how many more will be lost as a result of the OIS and Nanovation situations?

What we know is this - three large companies have come to the township with a lot of pomp and circumstance. Those same three companies have fallen flat on their faces, or are licking their wounds from a beating taken in the business world. The R&D park envisioned by the township several years ago isn't the technological hub once hoped for.

Township trustee Mary Gans announced his intent last year to revamp the township's economic development corporation. We haven't seen a lot of moving and shaking go on with this group in the last 52 weeks. Given what's happening at Five and Beck, we think now would be a very good time to get the group together and start asking some ques-

Well even set the agenda for the meeting what's the problem with Five Mile and Beck? Getting the answer to that question may help prevent another high-tech firm from going belly-up.

FOOTNOTE: (Look on the bright side — at least Five Mile and Beck doesn't host Enron offices, a Kmart or a Montgomery Ward. If it did, the intersection could be turned into a modern-day Mill Race Village.)

"Michigan's stake in the transformation of the auto industry cannot be overstated," said Engler. "The coming transformation means a new generation of vehicles. The new vehicles will require a new generation of engineers to design the. a new generation of plants to assemble them, and a new generation of workers to build them."

Engler's right. The stakes for Michigan are very, very big, especially when you realize that there are 10 engine plants and five transmission plants in Michigan engine powertrains that might well become obsolete in a decade.

You can't just assume that Michigan will become a leader in fuel cell technology," says Michigan Economic Development Cooperation CEO Doug Rothwell. "Although Michigan is plainly the center of the American auto industry, we don't necessarily have inherent strengths in fuel cell technology. This means we've got to be

Engler is expected to propose a detailed plan in the next couple of months to make detailed proposals about how to make Michigan the center for fuel cell research and development.

A look at Michigan's economic history provides some context for all this. In the 19th century, the first two waves of economic development centered on extracting natural resources, first exploiting the copper and iron ore deposits in the Upper Peninsula and next cutting the vast forests of the northern part of the state. The capital created by these two early industries formed the economic underpinnings for the development of our auto industry in the early part of the 20th century.

Since then, economic policy makers have been searching for the next big industry to power the state's economic progress.

A leading candidate — biotechnology emerged over the past decade. Stimulated by the MEDC, supported by Governor Engler and financed by money from the national tobacco settlement, the state has poured some \$50 million per year into the "Life Sciences Corridor," running from

Detroit through Ann Arbor and East Lansing to Grand Rapids. The University of Michigan, for example, is in the middle of building a \$200 million Life Sciences Center on the central campus, while the city of Ann Arbor just granted a tax abatement to encourage pharmaceutical giant Pfizer to expand greatly its research labs.

Skeptics question whether trying to graft an entire biotech industry onto a relatively limited existing base of company and infrastructure support will really work.

That's one of the great advantages of an economic strategy based on fuel cells for automobiles: We're not starting from scratch. Michigan already has a whale of a lot of automotive skill, experience and institutional momentum in the industry. and extending all that into a new kind of powertrain technology seems a logical thing to do.

This suggests a two-pronged fuel cell strategy for Michigan. Offensively, the idea is to build - promptly, firmly, immediately - on our technological and manufacturing strengths in the auto industry. Defensively, the goal is to get so far ahead that nobody else can catch up.

It's an exciting prospect. I'm looking forward to seeing the Governor's proposals as a centerpiece for building a big coalition auto companies, the supply chain, organized labor, the universities - to help Michigan's future.

Attention, please — let's talk Ritalin

There seems to be a growing confusion in Lansing over what lawmaking is really all about.

We ought not write laws based on extreme behaviors, on the worst case scenarios, when the vast majority of our residents are conducting themselves in an appropriate fashion" is an argument heard with increasing frequency in the

state's Capitol. Actually, that is exactly what

dốn't run around murdering other folks, but there is a law against that worst case scenario. Most of us don't hold up liquor stores at gunpoint either, yet that extreme behavior has also been banned.

Likewise, most teachers and school administrators are not telling parents to put their kids on Ritalin whether the children need the drug or not. Most don't jump to the conclusion that the cause of a bit of bad behavior is attention deficit hyperactivity disorder and try to pressure the parents into medicating the student.

The vast majority of educators in this state don't presume to have enough medical knowledge to diagnose ADHD. Very few would threaten to have a child expelled if parents refused to give their youngster the prescription. Fewer still, I'm sure, would threaten to initiate a

child abuse investigation of reticent moms and dads.

But if there is even a kernel of truth to the stories parents are telling legislators in committee hearings in Lansing, then apparently some teachers and administrators - likely a very small number are doing exactly that.

In hearings before the House Committee on Education last year, a long line of parents came forward to tell lawmakers about how they'd been pressured lawmaking revise by teachers and school officials to put about. A their boys and girls on mood or attenment of the tion-stabilizing medications.

It ought not be happening. According to the experts, properly diagnosing ADHD can be tricky. And only doctors are supposed to be determining the proper treatment and prescribing medica-

However rarely parents are being pressured, legislation to stop is very appropriate. And so far, three different versions of such a law have been proposed in Lansing.

The version making the most headway is a three-bill package — House Bills 5083, 5085-86 - spearheaded by Rep. Susan Tabor (R-Delta Township). The package would block teachers from recommending or urging that a child be placed on a drug to address behavioral problems, and it would bar teachers from making a diagnosis of the cause of bad behavior. Further, it would require school district to adopt policies on how "chronic behavioral conditions" be addressed, having teachers discuss the matter with parents, and perhaps recommending that the child undergo an educational

evaluation or a medical evaluation. The bills would also create a 15-member commission assigned to the job of studying whether Ritalin, and other drugs like it, are being over prescribed to Michigan school children. Passed in the House late last year, the package is scheduled to be taken up next in the Senate Education Committee.

Critics argue the bill ought not be passed because very few teachers are doing this anyway. And the law might be misconstrued. Opponents say that teachers, or more like parents, might misread this law as saving that school officials are not allowed to even talk to the family about the misbehavior of a youngster, or can't recommend that they see a medical professional about the problem.

That certainly sounds like a legitimate concern, but the authors of this legislation have anticipated it. The package in fact all three of the different versions of the proposal - make it clear that "this section does not prohibit school medical staff from recommending that a child be evaluated by an appropriate health care provider or prohibit school personnel from consulting with a health care provider concerning the child.







Unless you've recently purchased a home or filed a claim. chances are you haven't visited your homeowners insurance policy in a while.

The price you pay for your homeowners insurance can vary by hundreds of dollars depending on the company you buy your policy from.

Companies offer several types of discounts, but they don't offer the same discount or the same amount of discount in all states. That's why you should ask your agent or company representative about any discounts available to

From Insurance Information Institute (www.iii.org), the following 12 steps may help save money on your homeowners insurance.

Shop around

Friends, family, the phone book and Internet are some of the sources you can use to find homeowners insurers. Get a wide range of prices from several com-

But don't consider price alone. The insurer you select should offer both a fair price and excellent service. Quality service may cost a bit more, but you buy insurance in case you need to make a claim, so it's important to get a company with a good reputation. Talk to a number of insurers to get a feeling for the type of service they give. Ask them what they would do to lower your

Check the financial ratings of the companies with AM Best or Standard and Poor's.

Raise your deductible

Deductibles are the amount of money you have to pay toward a loss before your insurance company starts to pay. Deductibles on homeowners policies typically start at \$250. However, if you double that deductible you could save up to 12 percent. Increase it to \$1.000 and your savings potential increases to 24 percent. Buy your home and auto poli-

cies for the same insurer. Some companies that sell homeowners, auto and liability coverage will take 5 to 15 percent off your premium if you buy two or more policies from them.

When you buy a home

Consider how much insuring it will cost. A new home's electrical, heating and plumbing systems and overall structure are likely to be in better shape than those of an older house. Insurers may offer you a discount of 8 to 15 percent if your house is new.

Avoiding areas that are prone to floods can save you about \$400 a year for flood insurance. Homeowners insurance does not cover flood-related damage.

Also, the closer your home is to firefighters and their equipment, the lower your premium will be.

Insure home, not land

The land under your house isn't at risk from theft, windstorm, fire and the other perils covered in your homeowners policy. So don't include its value in deciding how much homeowners insurance to buy. If you do. you'll pay a higher premium than you should.

Improve your home security and safety

You can usually get discounts of at least 5 percent for a smoke detector, burglar alarm, or deadbolt locks. Some companies offer to cut your premium by as much as 15 or 20 percent if you install a sophisticated sprinkler system and a fire and burglar alarm that rings at the police station or other monitoring facility.

These systems aren't cheap and not every system qualifies for the discount. Before you buy such a system, find out what kind your insurer recommends and how much the device would cost and how much you'd save on

Stop smoking

Smoking accounts for more than 23,000 residential fires a year. That's why some insurers offer to reduce premiums if all the residents in a house don't

Seek out discounts for seniors Retired people stay at home more and spot fires sooner than working people and have more time for maintaining their homes. If you're at least 55-years-old and retired, you may qualify for a discount of up to 10 percent at some companies.

Get group coverage

Alumni and business associations often work out an insurance package with an insurance company, which includes a discount for association members. Ask your association's director if an insurer is offering a discount on homeowners insurance to you and your fellow graduates or colleagues.

It can pay to be loyal



Prosecutor: Northville cop deserves prison time

Christopher Andreoff and Oakland County prosecutor Cheryl Matthews pushed the hearing into early February. Andreoff said there were a number of issues that still needed to be resolved.

"I think Mr. Edgar is painfully aware of the effects of criminal sexual abuse and the punishment it entails," Matthews said. "And I believe he deserves prison time."

Matthews said the next hearing would determine whether the

case goes to trial or if there would be a plea.

Edgar, a 16-year veteran of the city department, was arraigned last fall at 52-1 District Court in Novi and then ordered by Judge Michael Batchik to stand trial for first degree and second degree criminal sexual conduct charges involving a child under the age of

Edgar has been accused of allegedly sexually mistreating his former step-granddaughter, who is now age 10. Matthews said during the preliminary examination

hearings accusative information was given that Edgar was said to have had slept undressed with his step-granddaughter and also made her touch him in an improper manner during the situ-

ations. The alleged incidents occurred throughout a time period starting when the girl was six years old.

According to Matthews, the punishment of the first degree

charge could result in any number of years of prison time, up to life, and the second-degree charge could result any number of years up to 15 years. Matthews said because Edgar served as a police officer for a number of years, and since he had experience in dealing with other persons accused of similar crimes, he should know better than anyone the consequences of the

charges.

Batchik allowed Edgar to be released on a \$25,000 personal recognizance bond, but ordered

him not to have any contact with the victim, the victim's family or any other minor.

Edgar's wife said she has since divorced him. According to Northville city police chief James Petres, Edgar was suspended from the department in early October because of the charges brought against him.







Beginning with a bare frame. Foley creates the luxurious and ornate lampshades with fabric. notions and trim.

She wraps the frame completely with a material similar to seam binding. Then she adds fabric. She finishes off each creation with trim



Attic ceilings: Unique decorating opportunities

Slanted ceiling can be converted into an off-beat headboard to add illusion of more space

Q: We're making a guest room in the attic and I'm confused by the slanting ceilings. They come down so far on two sides of the room that there's no place for the bed, the headboard is too high. The end walls won't work either: One has the closet and there are windows across the other. Should we just shove the side of the bed against the wall so the headboard is at right angles to it?

A Well, that could be one solution. It might look better if you push a dresser or table against the back side of the headboard to hold reading lamps and such. But jamming the bed against the wall that way not only threatens your guests with head bruises, it renders it so exasperatingly difficult to make up.

Better. I think, to take a cue from the photo we show here. It's off with the headboard, on with imagmation. What you see is a mere illusion, painted on the wall behind the bed with a center motif traced from the toile de Jouy fabric that dresses the rest of the room.

here, but the effect is both practical and charming. And it couldn't be much easier, according to our Bed and Bath Decorating Ideas & Projects* (Meredith Books). The editors suggest that you cut your headboard from a rectangle of brown kraft paper first to make sure it fits. Then, to ensure symmetry, fold the paper in half, draw and cut your pattern, and trace on the wall

before painting. A couple of other ideas for headboards that will fit your half-wall: a low bookshelf; a rectangle of garden trellis; a single panel of wallpaper that runs up the wall and onto the ceiling: sheer curtains hung from high on the wall and tied back to the slant on each side of the bed.

should take into consideration. A: How much time do you have?

There's been no attempt at realism. What's new for today's kitchen could take a week or two, and that's just to list the as-of-thismoment products.

There has been one major change in the very philosophy of kitchen design. You've heard of the classic "work triangle" (between the refrigerator, stove, and sinkl? Well. forget it. The triangle concept made sense in the era of one-cook kitchens but it falls short today. when we're all in there working and playing together.

At least one kitchen designer, Deborah Krasner, now nixes the old work triangle in favor of what she calls four work areas, or zones: wet, dry, hot and cold. Her idea, borrowed from high-pressure restaurant kitchens and applauded by professional organ-izations like the Hardwood Manufacturers Association, is to define each area by the activities and appliances it includes.

Krasner recommends that you pay special attention to surfacing materials in each area. If, for example, you have hardwood floors in vour kitchen, provide extra protection in the wet area, maybe a tile insert in the floor around the sink.

Backyard greenhouse offers cure to wintertime blues

It is cold and gray outside, and because there is no snow the landscape it looks rather drab. Yet I want to be around freshsmelling plants and walk among green trees.

I have dreamed of owning a greenhouse for a long time. I want to smell flowers and eat fresh fruits and vegetables. But most of all I want my own dwarf navel orange tree loaded with full-sized fruits.

Come to think of it, I also want a dwarf banana, a kiwi vine, orchids and lots of flowers. It might be easier to move to a warmer climate, and someday I might. But for now I am stuck in a cold climate without a greenhouse.

Originally, greenhouses were called hothouses because people thought tropical plants needed to be kept hot. Now we know that most plants are comfortable at room temperature or cooler. The original greenhouses were heated with coaland wood-burning stoves, but we can **BACKYARD GREENHOUSES**

use solar energy and supplement it with natural gas or propane if needed.

I tell my wife a greenhouse is not an impractical dream. It is a source of fresh coffee beans for her morning coffee and fresh tomatoes and other vegetables. The tomatoes and vegetables could grow yearround, but would probably just grow a few months earlier and later than those in an outdoor vegetable garden.

put the greenhouse, it could be a sunroom providing warmth in the winter, or it could extend our use of the patio next to the pond. We have been considering a gazebo, but a hexagonal greenhouse

would be a lot more fun. Greenhouses can be free-standing or lean-tos that attach to the house or garage. They can be constructed of rot-resistant wood, steel or aluminum. The glazing, as it

The polycarbonates are stronger than glass but more expensive, admit less light and yellow with age. Amazingly, greenhouses rarely have problems with the breaking glass. Some models have curved windows at the eaves that look really nice but might be hard to replace.

In building either a free-standing or leanto greenhouse, you will need a sturdy base. Each manufacturer has recommendations that must be followed closely to build a proper base, because a good base makes the greenhouse more stable. This is also the time to put in a good drainage system. Some greenhouses also have a step to get over when going in, so a ramp may be necessary.

Next, I want wide doors. I have seen kits with such narrow doors that carrying a large flower pot through them would be difficult. Doors help in ventilating the greenhouse, but rooftop vents, side windows and fans are also important. Some vents can be computer controlled. An evaporative water

cooler can be included in warm climates.

I want the sidewalls and roof crossbraces to be tall enough that I won't have to duck when I walk inside. Speaking of cross-braces. I'm not fond of the shiny silver appearance of aluminum frames. But www.hallsgreenhouses.com offers a green covering for them that blends in better visually. And it is possible to get powdercoated aluminum in other colors.

Before constructing a free-standing greenhouse, there are many things to consider, such as how difficult it will be to reach it in the winter if you must shovel a path through snow.

In the summer your greenhouse will need shade. Are there trees available? If so, will they present a hazard by dropping leaves and branches on the greenhouse? You will want to provide for electricity and water while you are building the base.

If the greenhouse is to be attached to the house, how will you access it? Where will the water and electricity come from, and can you connect to any existing drain lines?
