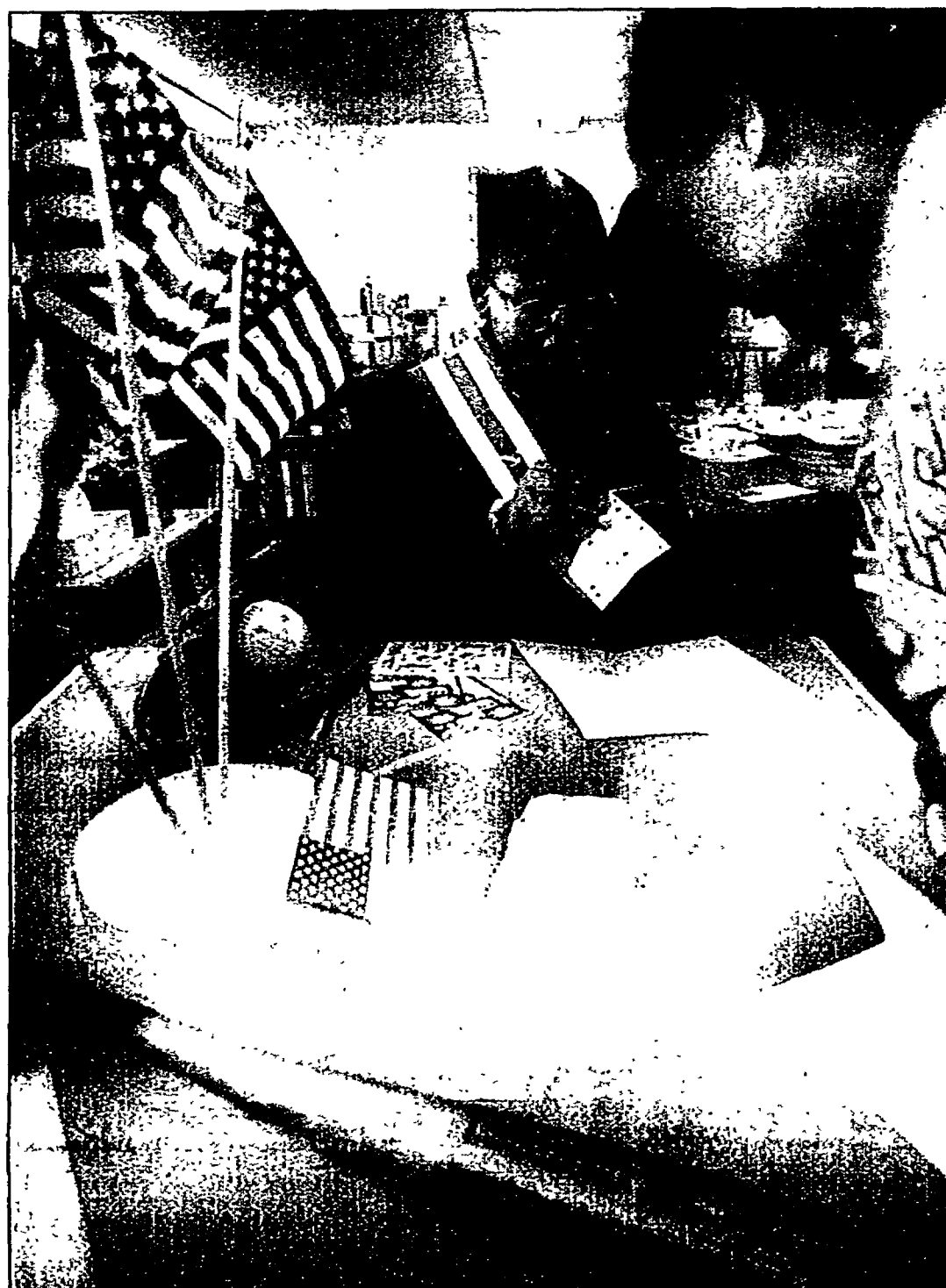

## Trio nabbed for theft of motorcycles

Three men were arraigned at 35th District Court on Friday for attempting to steal a motorcycle out of the Park Place Apartment Complex parking lot in the wee hours of the morning.

Kortez Green, Allen Wilson III, and Maurice Williams, residents of Detroit and Southfield, were seen attempting to load a motorcycle into the back of a red Chevy Astro, which already contained another stolen bike.

Upon arrival of Northville Township police, the suspects were observed in action. When confronted by police, Green, who had been standing in the open door of the Astro, complied with police instructions and placed himself in a prone position on the ground. He was arrested and taken into custody. Wilson and Williams fled on foot.

Officers chased after Wilson with the help of a thermal imaging camera. Wilson was apprehended after he dropped to the ground when officers yelled out, "Don't make me shoot" although police said a gun was never pulled during the chase.

The last suspect to be caught was Williams, who was seen by a

witness exiting a panel truck later in the day.

According to detective Bill Helke, Detective Paul Sumner was on his way to the police station and had observed the same black male standing at the corner of Seven Mile and Northville Road.

"When [Sumner] arrived in the station and was brought up to speed, he realized the description of the suspect matched that of the man he had seen," said Helke. "The information was relayed over the radio and suspect was subsequently arrested at the Clark Gas Station on Main Street."

According to Sumner, all three suspects have extensive criminal histories.

"This is a great example of we can do when we get calls from the community because it doesn't take very long for guys like this to steal a motorcycle," said Helke, who credited sergeant Kevin Roberts and officer David Roberts for doing a "great job."

"We hope this will put an end to a rash of motorcycle theft," Helke said.

The trio is expected to appear in 35th District Court for their preliminary examinations on April 26 at 8:30 a.m. Each suspect faces a \$50,000 cash bond.

## Water pressure: resident bills set to spike

### City residents to face hike in rates at around 10 percent

Don't like the idea of paying more for water? If you're a Northville resident, this will probably be the summer of your discontent.

Northville city residents may be looking at yet another spike in water and sewage rates, due to the increased rates being implemented by the city of Detroit and Wayne County.

According to assistant city manager and finance director Nicolette Bateson, the city's water rate will jump 13.7 percent and the sewer rate will increase 10 percent as of July 1.

Although the bi-monthly charge is not to be affected, Northville is proposing increases of 9½ percent for water, 7½ percent for sewage, and the dual meter rate at 9 percent.

Residents would be looking at a proposed total increase of 8.8 percent in their bills.

"It's a touchy subject because our water rates are so high," said public works director James Gallogly. "But the sewers cannot handle all of the water going through the system at once during peak times. So we have to pay for our share of the improvement costs."

Gallogly's beliefs got the backing of Detroit water and sewer department public affairs manager George Ellenwood and acting Wayne County public works director Kerreen Conkey.

"The system-wide improvements, such as the building of a new water treatment plant, is a cost to be shared by all 125 customer communities who receive water service," Ellenwood said.

"We really are a pass-through," Conkey said. "The bulk of the system cost is really Detroit water and sewer department."

The total budget for 2002-2003 is \$34 million based on

### Township staring at 12% beginning July 1

Much like their Northville city counterparts, Northville Township residents will likely have to deal with a significant increase in water and sewage rates, due to the double digit increases from Detroit and Wayne County.

According to township public services director Don Weaver, the increases must be passed on to residents.

"I'm certain we will have to pass

on the increase," he said. "It's just a question of when."

The township is looking at an increase of 14.2 percent for water, and 10 percent for sewage. The current cost for the services is \$13.27 per 1,000 cubic feet of water with a jump to \$15.15, and \$7.66 per 1,000 cubic feet of water treated that will be going up to \$8.43. Both increases will become effective July 1.

"These are our wholesale costs. That is what we pay the city of Detroit for water and sewage treatment," explained Weaver. "But it is not the same as what we charge our customers. To that we add another 42 percent for the retail costs to pay

# Township gets perfect compliance in booze buy

March 26. An 18-year-old decoy was used in the alcohol sting that began at 2 a.m. on April 10.

According to township detective Paul Sumner, many establishments were involved in both stings to determine the level of compliance regarding the sale of tobacco or alcohol products to minors.

The teen decoys attempted to purchase tobacco or alcohol products in their respective stings. Police were looking for compliance with the law regard-

ing the checking of identification as well as refusing to sell to the minors.

"The decoy operations are conducted in order to keep the stores, the employees and the community and youth are aware that Northville Township is a zero tolerance community for alcohol and tobacco use by minors," said Sumner.

Steve Schulz, who owns Schulz Cap N' Cork with his brother Lee, wasn't the least bit surprised to find that his employees obey the law by refusing to sell to minors.

"We take the time to go through the proper instruction of our employees so that things result in a positive manner. We've been a part of this community for 18 years and are proud to live up to its standards," said Schulz. "I'm very pleased with the way things turned out."

Each business has or will receive a congratulatory letter for complying with the law.

## Police Reports

### NORTHVILLE TOWNSHIP POLICE BRIEFS

**LOOKING FOR A CRIB:** Officers were called to investigate a suspicious vehicle in the parking lot of the Babies R Us located on Haggerty Road on April 15. The man in the car told officers he was homeless. He was advised to leave the area and complied.

**ARE YOU THERE?** Dispatchers received a 911 hang up call on April 14. Dispatchers got a busy signal when they attempted to call back. When contact was made, the respondent told dispatchers that her six-year old daughter had been playing with the phone.

**DUDE, WHERE'S MY CAR?** Officers were called to investigate report of a CVS Pharmacy customer from the store parking lot on Haggerty Road on April 12. Upon investigation, a vehicle belonging to the 55-year-old Livonia resident was found parked behind the store. The man was reportedly taking several medications and may have misplaced

his vehicle because of it. The vehicle was moved to the front lot and officers drove the man home.

**SMELLY SEWAGE:** A Winchester Drive resident contacted police on April 11 to report a "bad chemical smell" coming from the sewer drain at the corner of Sutters Lane and Sutters Court. Officers investigated and advised that there was a "strong odor of bad sewage when you stand near the drain" but "no smell of any kind of chemicals." Officers contacted the water and sewage department and advised them of the situation. Water and sewer stated that they will attend to the problem.

**MISSING CEMENT MIXER:** Officers were dispatched to investigate stolen construction equipment on April 10 from a location on Stoneridge. Both the reporting person and the victim/owner of the cement mixer work for Lomas Heritage Homes. The reporting person, who spoke on behalf of the victim, stated that the \$200 cement mixer had last been seen on April 9 at around 8

p.m., but was missing the next morning. The mixer had been chained, but the chain was also taken. With no suspects, witnesses or evidence, officers closed the case due to insufficient evidence.

**OUIL:** Officers observed a silver 1997 Camaro failing to stop for a flashing red signal at Northville Road and Seven Mile on April 10 at 2:30 a.m. The officer followed the Camaro and observed it to be driving with the center of the vehicle directly above the dashed white markings for the two eastbound lanes. The 45-year-old woman from Westland was pulled over and stated she had had a "couple glasses of wine" that evening. A strong odor of intoxicants was coming from the inside of the vehicle.

When asked to exit the vehicle for sobriety tasks, the woman remained in the car attempting to put her papers back into her wallet. The woman was asked a second time and stated that she was trying and was just "flustered" from having been pulled over. She then complied and exited the vehicle, advising the officer

that she had a college degree, when she was asked to perform the one leg stand, the woman stated that she did not know if she could do that "under any circumstances."

After administration of PBT rights, the woman was administered the PBT with a result of 0.128 BAC. The woman was placed under arrest for OUIL and was scheduled to appear at 35th District Court on April 17.

**STOLEN AUTO:** A 26-year-old Northville woman contacted police on April 14 to report her 1999 Chevy Cavalier stolen. The woman reported that she and the 28-year-old suspect from Detroit had been arguing on their way to her parents residence on Andover Court. After parking and exiting the vehicle, the suspect grabbed the woman's keys and fled in her car. A short time after reporting the incident to police, the suspect was stopped on south bound Interstate 275. The woman stated that she did not want to press charges. She only wanted her car back. The suspect was released to the Wayne County Sheriff's Department

due to a previous warrant.

**DOG BITE:** Officers responded to a call of a dog bite on Oakleaf on April 11. When they arrived at the scene, the 3-year-old victim and her mother her being transported by ambulance to University of Michigan Hospital in Ann Arbor. Investigation revealed that the victim's sister had been petting the dog, which was restrained by an electric collar used to keep him in the perimeter of the electric fence. The victim approached the dog and was bitten on her shoulder. She received a deep puncture wound and a long laceration. The dog is being observed at Parkway Veterinary Clinic due to the incident.

### CITY POLICE BRIEFS

**UNDERAGE DRINKING:** Two teenagers were arrested on April 13 for underage alcohol consumption. The 17 and 20-year-old males were spotted in the rear lot of a strip mall on Novi Road at approximately 1:30 a.m. Officers found the 17-year-old

Canton resident crouched between two trash bins and noticed intoxicants on his breathe. He stated he had been drinking beer with his friend, but hadn't had any "hard stuff." The youth said he had been drinking because he was upset about breaking up with his girlfriend. The teen was administered his PBT rights before the test was administered for a result of 0.057.

Officers then noticed another male walking away from the front of Novi Cleaners, located in the strip mall. The 17-year-old identified the 20-year-old Canton resident as his friend. Officers also smelled intoxicants on his breathe but the subject was argumentative when officers questioned him about his alcohol consumption. He began questioning the officer about his alcohol consumption when he was under 21. The subject eventually complied with officer instructions and was administered his PBT rights and test with results being 0.107.

Both subjects were arrested and are scheduled to appear in court on May 8.

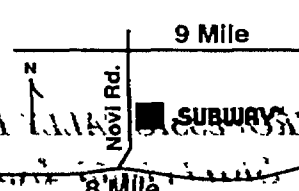

# Emergency cellular calls to be directly connected

Beginning April 17, the Northville Township police department will be initiating a testing phase in which 911 cellular phone calls made by Cingular Wireless customers made within the tower's vicinity will be directly routed to township police department. Currently, all emergency cellular phone calls are immediately routed to the State Police before being transferred to the appropriate police department.

According to Marsha Bianconi, coordinator for the Conference of Western Wayne emergency telephone district — which encompasses the 18 member communities and Detroit Metro Airport — the program is being implemented due to a federal mandate. April 17 will mark the beginning of a three phase process.

Although Cingular is the first to become involved, cellular customers from all providers will eventually be able to speak to a dispatcher at the

nearest police department as well.

"Once we complete the implantation of Cingular, we will begin working with other vendors," said Bianconi.

"When the towers within the community pick up a cellular signal, they will be transferred to the nearest police department in that area, but there are still going to be opportunities where dispatchers are going to be transferring calls to other stations or the state police," said police chief John Werth.

Werth also said that the new system will "lighten the load" on the state police.

"It will allow us to be able to better provide service to our residents," he said.

Dispatch/records supervisor Kelly Pigeon believes the new program to be a step in the right direction but understands that there will be problems to address while the dispatchers become familiar with taking cellular emergency calls.

"When emergency phone calls are

made from a land-based phone, the caller's address and information are instantly available to us. We are trained to verify that information to make sure we are sending the help you need to the correct location," she said. "But with a cell phone, we don't get any of that. All we know is that you are in the tower area."

Pigeon suggested that callers make certain to provide their address or exact location to the dispatchers immediately.

"Callers need to be aware of the fact that it is not the same when you call us from home. We need to be told where you are. We don't know where you are calling from to get you the help you need," she said.

# Desira: every child should have support from schools

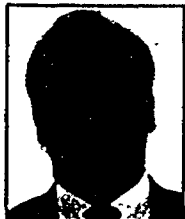

Northville resident Richard Desira has entered the contest to join the Northville school board and is hoping voters will cast their ballots in his favor later this year.

The election for board candidates is slated for June 10.

In June, voters will be asked to appoint two individuals to two seats on the Northville board of education.

The two school board seats will be vacated by current board president Martha Nield and board vice-president Tom Gudritz. Nield and Gudritz announced in late February that they would not be seeking re-election for another term on the board. Both have served on the Northville Board of Education since

1994.

Desira, a long-time resident of Northville, has been married for 22 years and currently has three children attending Northville Public Schools. He is currently the director of Desira Chiropractic Life Center in Westland.

"One of the key things that really does excite me is to see young men and young women achieve their dreams and aspirations in their life and see them successful in what they do," said Desira. "That's exciting for me."

"I believe every child should always have their support from their families, their school system and the community."

Desira will be running against Northville resident Ken Roth and Novi residents Maria Foley and Karen Paciorek.

"I'm looking forward to working with the school system," he said.

Desira said his primary concerns are the students and the taxpayers.

In a prepared written statement, he said, "I am concerned with the needs of our chil-

dren, the taxpayers of our community and the school district's employees. With the influx of new residents and the improving tax base, I would like to see increased considerations for all taxpayers, including long time residents who might not be able to afford the increasing property taxes on their homes. I intend to review why there appears to be a need for new or increased millages even though we have a growing tax base with the growth of Northville and the construction of new homes in our district. For this reason, when I am elected to the school board, I would like to create an oversight committee to look into ways to streamline costs and eliminate any fiscal waste."

Desira said he wanted to improve the level of communication between the school

district and parents.

"I will be encouraging the parents, our students and our teachers to have more input in the direction the school district takes in our future academic and athletic opportunities for the civic growth and success of our children," he said in his statement.

Desira said he has not set up a campaign strategy at this point.

In his statement, he said, "After I am elected, I will develop programs that will help our children meet their dreams and aspirations, while keeping costs fiscally responsible. I want to see a committee to review the long term and short term plans of the district and find ways to have them more encompassing of the needs of the district using our existing resources and without the need to continually ask for more funding."

Desira is a former radio talk show host and health/motivational speaker. He has held every office within the Life University Alumni Association. While president of the

alumni association he also sat on the board of trustees of the university. He also said he is affiliated with the American GI Forum, which works to develop the abilities of Detroit youth to compete successfully in amateur or professional levels of boxing and increase their self-esteem.

"What we do today determines our children's tomorrow," Desira said in his prepared statement. "For this reason, I want to see the Northville school district meet the needs of our youth through improved academic and athletic programs. I would love to see the development of programs that allow the dreams and aspirations of our youth to be met, as well as programs that will increase the student's sense of security and create an atmosphere that is more conducive to learning."

## Cops turn to the dark side: thermal imaging camera

If you're trying to run and hide from Northville Township police, your job just got a lot more difficult.

Northville Township police recently received a government grant for purchase of a \$12,000 thermal imager manufactured by Raytheon. The Palm IR Thermal Imager will enhance officer safety while on the job as well as enable better serve the community.

According to Sergeant Matthew Mayes, the thermal imager is a heat seeking camera will allow officers to search and rescue lost children or search for fleeing suspects by sensing the differences in heat viewed on the screen. Because the camera senses heat, it works best at night since the surrounding areas are cooler.

Mayes was sent to Florida for a four-day training period paid by through the grant to learn how to properly use the camera and understand how to decipher the images on the camera's screen. He is now training the rest of the department in the camera's use.

"It's referred to as passive and non-intrusive technology," said Mayes. "It does not see through objects, it only sees heat. But it will tell you the difference in heat by

color. So if it looks at a person, they turn white on the screen and everything else would be dark."

The department will use the camera for search and rescue operations, searching for fleeing suspects, and structure profiling in which officers would be able to determine if marijuana was being grown in a home, based on the heat transfers picked up by the camera.

Mayes also explained that the camera will enable officers to find contraband that may have been

thrown away by a fleeing suspect.

"If an object like a gun or marijuana is thrown, the heat transferred from the heat of the hand of the person who was carrying it will remain with the object for up to 40 minutes. It will appear to be glowing white with the thermal imager."

Officer safety on the job will be greatly enhanced with the camera's use as well.

"Instead of using a flashlight around a corner when looking for a suspect in a dark building, we'll be able to use the imager. We'll have the element of surprise. They won't," Werth said.

"The \$12,000 for the thermal imager had actually been budgeted for the fiscal year of 2001," said police chief John Werth. "We held off on the purchase when we received the grant and learned we were getting it absolutely free."

Werth said the camera will be out on afternoon and midnight shifts at all times.

"When we can get the tools to better serve the community at no cost to the township it is outstanding," he said.

# Foley: good-quality schools ensure healthy kids

Maria Foley will likely be on pins and needles in early June. Foley, a Novi resident, has declared her candidacy in the Northville Public Schools Board of Education election.

The election for the board candidates will take place June 10.

Foley will be one of four individuals running for two available seats on the board.

The two school board seats will be vacated by current board president Martha Nield and board vice-president Tom Gudritz. Nield and Gudritz announced in late February that they would not be seeking re-election for another

term on the board. Both have served on the Northville board of education since 1994.

Foley will be running against Novi resident Karen Paciorek and Northville residents Ken Roth and Richard Desira.

"I always try to be very involved with my kids' school," said Foley, who has earned a bachelor's degree in elementary education from Oakland University. "I think that it's important for everyone to be involved in the schools.

I believe our children's education is the foundation of our community."

Foley is a wife and mother of three children. The oldest is enrolled in the first grade at Our Lady of Victory.

Once Foley learned of the available seats on the board, she said she thought running for a position would result in a better way of becoming engaged within the schools and the community.

"It presented a great opportunity to get involved," she said.

Foley, who has been a health chairman with the Novi co-op preschool for the past three years, is also involved with the PTO group at Our Lady of Victory.

"Good quality schools...ensure

our children have a good basis on which to grow," said Foley. "I think we should always put our children first. I think it's more important to do what's right than what's popular."

She also said that the quality of the schools is vital to the community, whether or not residents have children enrolled in the district.

Foley, a Michigan native, spent a few years living in Texas before moving back to this state. She said the caliber of the school district had a significant impact in the decision to move to this area.

In addition, Foley said she would like the opportunity to join the leaders of Northville Public Schools.

"If I don't do it, who's going to do it?" she said. "I want to be a part of that decision making process."

Foley also described her approach she plans to use in her campaign for the Northville school board.

"I want to do a lot of door-to-door and meet with people and find out what they think is most important in our schools," she said. "I'll try to send out flyers and let people get to know who I am."

Foley said she is interested in being involved with the district and believes children are a main focal point.

"I think the children in our community are the foundation," she said. "They are our future leaders. We need to do what's best for

them."

But regardless of whether voters appoint her to one of the two available seats, Foley said her focus won't change.

"Even if I were not to win this election, I'm still going to be involved with our schools and attend the board meetings," she said. "Even if I didn't win the election, it doesn't change the way I feel about the schools. I'm not here to get fame or fortune. I'm here to do what's in the best of the children."

# Roth: schools are important community cornerstone

Ken Roth wants your vote.

Roth, a Northville resident, is one of four individuals who are seeking appointment to two available seats on the Northville Public Schools Board of Education.

The election for board candidates is slated for June 10.

The two school board seats will be vacated by current board president Martha Nield and board vice-president Tom Gudritz. Nield and Gudritz announced in late February that they would not be seeking re-election for another term on the board. Both have served on the Northville Board of Education since 1994.

Roth is a current small business owner and former prosecuting attorney.

"I enjoy the issues," Roth said. "The schools are really an important cornerstone of the community. The position deserves someone that has broad experience and has shown a commitment to the issues. I can't think of a single community that you'd want to live in that doesn't have good schools. If you don't have good schools, you're not going to have a good community to live in."

Roth was also a member of the Continuing Excellence Award for Northville's Children Committee.

"I spent a lot of time and effort on that," said Roth, who added that he has run in past years for a seat on the board of education. "I have a pretty good understanding of the

district's issues and the history of where the district's coming from. There aren't many people that bring a perspective of prior public service and private business ownership. I think it really does put me in a

unique perspective."

Roth will be running against Northville resident Richard Desira and Novi residents Maria Foley and Karen Paciorek.

Roth said his past experiences have prepared him for a potential seat on the board.

"I have a lot of experience in complex decision making," he said, referring to his legal background. "I might bring a particular expertise in areas of public safety."

He also addressed a key issue

that Northville Public Schools is encountering.

"We are constantly facing growth of the district," said Roth. "[The] continuing issue of growth will be in the background constantly. It seems every week that a new subdivision goes up."

Roth also said he hopes he will be able to join the board and continue the work that is being done.

"I don't come to this as a candidate seeking dramatic change in the function of the board," he said.

"I think the path the board has been on is a good, solid path, but it will require experienced people who understand the issues to continue that path."

Roth said the newly elected candidates to the school board will have a large role to fill.

"The board's losing two very qualified and able members," said Roth. "Quite frankly, it's a little daunting to think of filling the shoes of either one of them."

Roth is married and has resided

in Northville over five years.

"This is a great town," he said. Roth said he plans to make an effort to let residents know where he stands on issues.

"It's a fairly congenial campaign. It's just getting out there and meeting people and letting people make their decision about you."

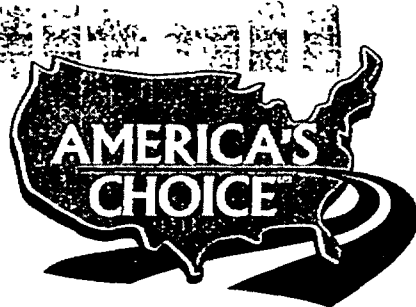

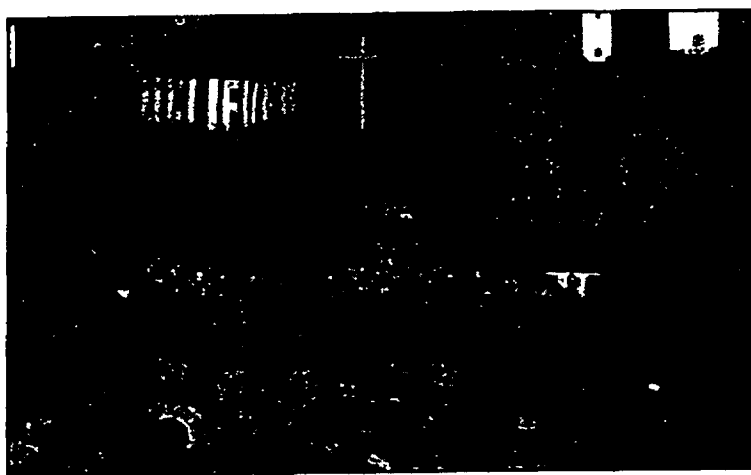

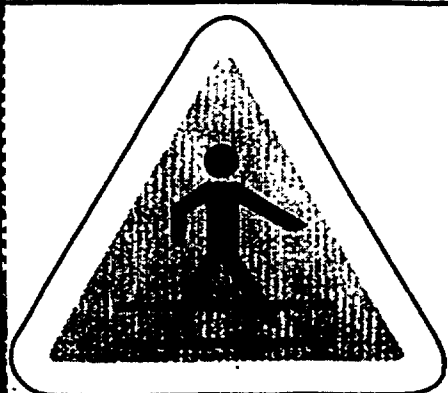

## Coffee and a dozen: Donut Scene satisfies

Vera Alverson stood smiling behind the counter of Northville's Donut Scene Monday morning. She greeted an incoming construction worker who requested eight large coffees and two dozen doughnuts to go. Alverson then quickly turned and began filling the Styrofoam cups and preparing additional pots of coffee. The aroma of the fresh-brewed beverage drifted through the air as she carefully placed each doughnut in neat rows inside the white boxes. After counting back the change, the man left with a smile on his face.

It's all in a day's work for Vera Alverson.

Alverson, a manager at Donut Scene, has been a part of the business community and serving oth-

ers for 15 years.

But the Donut Scene features more than just doughnuts and coffee. Along with these treats, patrons will find themselves enjoying old-fashioned, friendly, warmhearted service coupled with a neighborly smile and conversation.

An array of bagels, muffins, croissants, juices and soda are available, however, the doughnuts are arguably the main lure for residents.

"You can ask anybody in town where a good doughnut is and they'll tell you Donut Scene," said Alverson. "I just think we have the best doughnuts of anybody. We use only the best ingredients."

However, early risers get the best selection. Alverson said the shop is nearly sold out by 10 a.m. Some patrons, she said, arrive half an hour before the shop is scheduled to open.

The legacy of warm hospitality and tradition can be seen in not only the caliber of service but even down to type of servingware used. "I think this is the only place

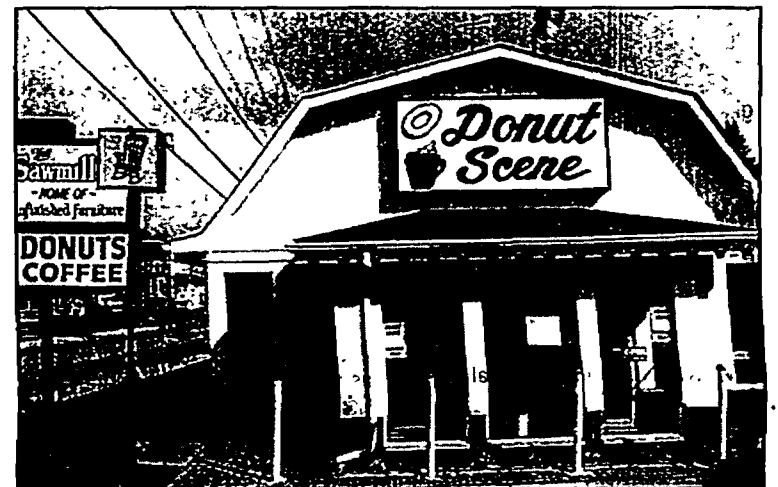
that still serves coffee in a real coffee cup," she said.

For Alverson, the "regulars" and other community members filtering through the Donut Scene with smiles and morning chatter is a highlight she enjoys.

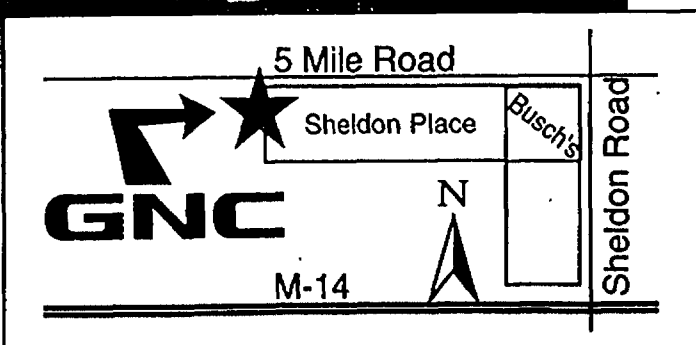
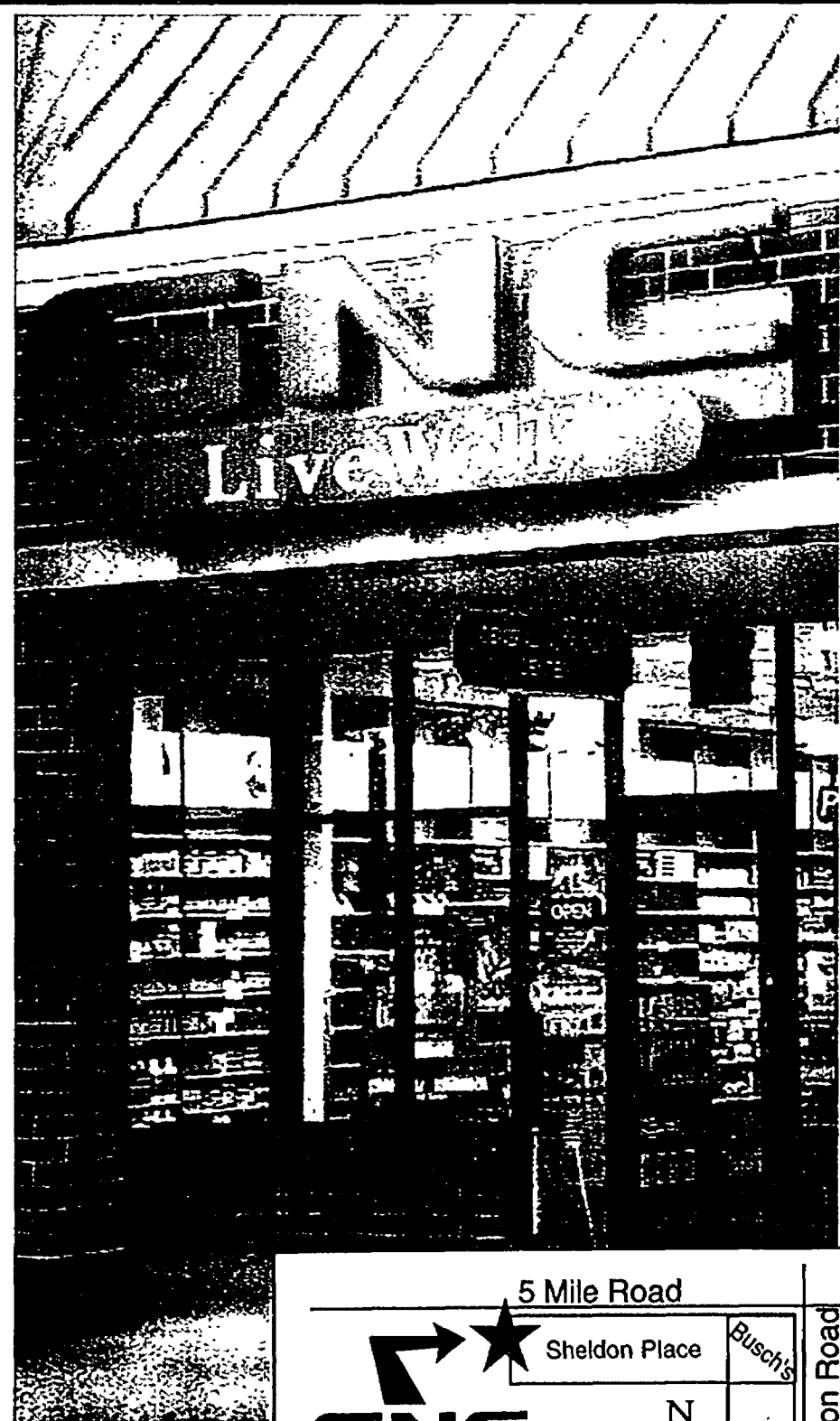
"It's fun," she said. "I really get to meet a lot of people. I really like the job. The people are fabulous."

# U.S. - Canada trash deal not signed since 1986

The U.S.-Canada treaty allowing for the importation of municipal trash into Michigan has not been followed since it was signed in 1986, a recent memorandum by the Congressional Research Service concluded.

And Michigan lawmakers are upset about it.

The treaty required notification of shipments of waste and allowed the Environmental Protection Agency 30 days to object.

"The two governments have not implemented the notice and consent provisions of bilateral agreement for purposes of municipal solid waste shipments. Consequently, EPA has not received any notices for such shipments," the memo concludes.

Further, the U.S. has not objected to any shipments since 1992, nor has the EPA protested the lack of notification, the memo states.

"If we are not complying with the terms of the agreement, it is time to get rid of the treaty altogether," said Rep. Mike Bishop (R-Rochester).

"It is most disturbing to think that the protections provided in the agreement between our nations are not working," Rep. Nancy Cassis (R-Novi) said. "The people of this state have every right to know that all prudent measures are being enforced to protect our citizens and environment."

Bishop and Rep. Mike Kowall (R-White Lake) have introduced several bills in Lansing they say will bring regulation of international shipments in line with those regulations already placed on local haulers. They're also proposing increased inspections of trash shipments at the border.

In Washington, U.S. Reps. Mike Rogers (R-Howell) and Joe Knollenberg (R-Bloomfield Hills) are pushing legislation that would allow states to restrict or ban international shipments of trash.

Bruce Parker, president of the Washington D.C.-based National Solid Wastes Management Association, sees all that as an attack on free trade.

"The courts concluded trash is an article of commerce," he said. "They did distinguish between good articles of commerce and bad articles of commerce."

Parker's trade association represents 400 waste hauling and collection companies nationwide.

"The state of Alabama recently spent \$700 million to attract auto plants to that state," Parker continued. "What would happen if the state of Alabama decided to prohibit cars from crossing the border into the state in order to boost sales for its own auto plants?"

Parker noted that while Michigan accepts municipal trash from Toronto for disposal in landfills here, the state also sends out 55,000 tons of "hazardous waste" to Canada each year. Restrictions on the importation of waste to Michigan might result in Canada "retaliating" by blocking those shipments to its disposal facilities.

More comes into Michigan than goes out. Imports of trash to Michigan landfills, from eight other states and Canada are estimated at 3.116 million tons for 2001.

Canada is a specific concern because lawmakers estimate its

trash constitutes 17 percent of the garbage going into state landfills, up from 11 percent just two years ago.

According to Kowall, the Toronto city council has recently affirmed its decision to send all its municipal waste to Michigan in the future, declining to expand its own landfills.

That could add 750,000 tons of garbage per year.

"Their main concern was about possible poisoning of groundwater," Kowall said. "I think we need to give them a geography lesson. All of the lakes surrounding Michigan flow into Lake Ontario. It gets right back to them, eventually, it just takes a little longer."

Along with regulations intended to match those put on local Michigan haulers, Kowall wants legislation calling for inspections of all shipments.

"Terrorism is a paramount concern," he said. "If I wanted to smuggle something into the country, what better place than inside a bunch of smelly, nasty dirty diapers ... They say it is compacted trash, but still people could put anything in there — weapons, bacterial agents, anything."

Chris Close, communications director for Knollenberg, said the congressman believes states should be able to determine whether to take international shipments of trash "because the people at the local level are in the best position to decide whether it is appropriate."

He said he believes the proposal pending in Washington would pass constitutional muster with the courts. Judges tossed out a Michigan law allowing counties to block shipment across their borders, but that "kicked it back to congress" for a decision, Close said.

Why should trash be treated differently than other items of cross-border commerce and free trade?

"I suppose it is because trash is viewed negatively," he said. "That's about all I can say about that."

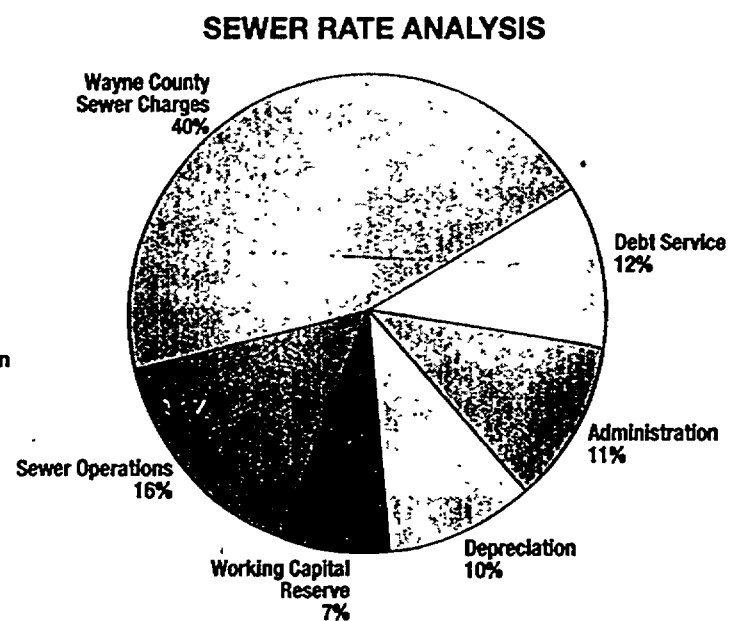

## Larger water bills: better get used to it

If the week's unseasonable warmth wasn't enough to provide a preview of summer, the announcement by Northville and Northville Township officials that residents would help foot the bill of yet another water and sewer increase probably did the trick.

Both the township and city are looking at substantial increases in water and sewer rates beginning July 1. If you're a resident in either community, you'll be doing your part to help cover the additional costs being incurred.

The Northvilles are facing an uphill battle — literally. The topography of Wayne County has the city and the township at one of the highest elevations in the entire county. Couple that with the fact the two communities are near the western edge of the area serviced by Detroit's sewer and water system, and the delivery costs get even more expensive.

Both communities are doing what they can to help keep the financial hurt to a minimum. The city of Northville has taken a substantial bite out of the water system loss. Where the city had once been losing as much as 46 percent of its water to leaks in the city pipelines city officials are now looking at a loss of just more than 11 percent.

And it's not as if city officials are embracing the idea of forcing its residents to shoulder a greater

financial burden. Mayor Chris Johnson expressed his empathy about the water rate situation.

"When you take, the administrative costs and divide them by 6,000 and then take the same number and divide it by 28,000, the per-person charge is very different," said Johnson. "That's part of being a small community. It's expensive."

For the township's part, officials there have been working through a mountain of red tape and financial hurdles in the hopes of eventually breaking free of Detroit's water and sewer services.

Between partnerships with the Western Township Utilities Authority and the Ypsilanti Communities Utilities Authority, the township is taking part in a delicate financial balancing act. Township public services director Don Weaver said independence was the long-range goal.

"Ultimately, we will be out of the Detroit sewage system, but for the next five or six years, we will still have this blend going on," he said.

What that means for township residents is that the additional financial burden being felt this year will likely be a spring tradition for some time to come.

The moral of the story seems to be this: if you like your grass green, be prepared to be shelling out more green of your own to make it that way.

## The arts deserve a second chance

My older son, Scott, is a second year resident in internal medicine in Denver. Kathy and I went to visit him about a month ago. We came away much impressed with the vibrant arts and cultural scene in the Mile High City.

Although the Denver Art Museum does not have half the collection of the Detroit Institute of Arts, it was absolutely filled with school kids and teachers and with senior citizens.

The zoo is similarly well attended, as is the well regarded Natural History Museum. Upon checking around, I discovered that the real reason the Denver area is doing so well for all its citizens is — dreaded ideal — regional cooperation. The six counties in the Denver area have banded together to fund their arts and cultural institutions with the proceeds from a sales tax. A little over half of the money goes to the Big Four institutions, but a bunch goes back to local arts and cultural groups in the participating counties.

It's a lot like the plan sponsored by the Southeast Michigan Cultural Coalition that would ask voters in Oakland and Wayne counties to consider a 0.5 property tax millage to raise around \$45 million a year. Two-thirds of the money would go to 17 regional arts institutions — including

the DIA, Detroit Zoo, Cranbrook Art Museum, Henry Ford Museum and Greenfield Village, the Holocaust Memorial Center and Meadowbrook Hall — with the remainder going to local arts institutions. For a home with a taxable value of \$150,000, the increased tax amounts of \$37.50 per year.

A similar plan was narrowly defeated two years ago in November.

Sponsors of the plan initially hoped to get it on the August primary ballot for lots of good reasons. There's less clutter and cheaper TV advertising rates than in November, and the lively gubernatorial primary race is supposed to attract a big Democratic and female voter turnout — both groups are presumed to be more pro-culture than Republicans and males.

But last week the Oakland County General Government Committee voted to table the issue until its June 3 meeting, reasoning that adding arts and culture to the August primary ballot might jeopardize votes on other vital local services. To their credit, Oakland County officials are meeting promptly after the May 28 cutoff date to put an item on the August primary ballot.

At their June meeting, they should vote definitively to put the initiative to a November vote, if only to give the proponents (and opponents, for that matter) time to raise money and educate the public about the pros and cons of the idea.

In my own view, this is one of those sensible measures that merits support, if only because the survival of our precious cultural institutions has over the years been threatened by withdrawal of state support from Lansing. After all, places like the DIA and the Zoo contribute enormously to the

quality of life in this region. They help local businesses attract highly educated workers and they contribute to keeping skilled graduates in Michigan after they leave college.

Sure, any tax increase — \$37.50, more or less — is a hit to the budget. And certainly, some of the institutions that will benefit already charge admission. But the funds from this proposal will go to pay for price-discounted programs for kids, teachers, seniors. Without the additional support for arts institutions from the millage, families hoping to go the Zoo for a Saturday outing, for example, will pay a lot more than they do now. And, for those of a parochial frame of mind, much of the money will go back to local arts and culture groups.

It's recently become fashionable to be tough minded about public expenditures to improve the quality of life for all. "Let the users pay for it," goes the beguiling line. Well, if the only people who are going to pay for the DIA or Henry Ford Museum are just the people who go there in any given year, over the years we're not likely to have a DIA or a Henry Ford Museum around for us to use.

At that point, the tough minded among us will no doubt be the first to ask loudly and crossly just who lost the DIA or Henry Ford Museum. I hope there will be people around who tell 'em to look in the mirror.

## Unemployment changes aren't altruism

As Michigan's new unemployment benefit levels take effect, on the signing of recent legislation by Gov. John Engler, there will surely be a lot of self-congratulation among lawmakers about what has been done to help jobless workers.

The motivation, sponsors said, was to help those who have found themselves out of work in the current economic downturn, since much of the slowdown came in the wake of Sept. 11.

But before anyone in Lansing sprains an arm patting themselves on the back, folks back home would be well advised to take a close look at all the little details included in the bill.

The improvement in benefits comes with a cost. Many of the little provisions that were included in the final version received little attention from the press. The wrangling was so contentious over what the maximum benefit should be and the proposal, eventually dropped, to add a "waiting week" that it was difficult to focus on the other little details.

Granted, lawmakers did hike the maximum weekly benefit from \$300 to \$362. The Michigan Chamber of Commerce has estimated that alone will carry a cost of \$225 million to the unemployment trust fund. There is no such thing as free money, so eventually it has to be replaced. Sooner or later, the amount will be charged to businesses.

Nonetheless, as Rick McHugh of the National Employment Law Project points

out, only about 60 percent of laid off workers get the maximum. They had to have worked full time and earned about \$30,000 annually to hit the mark. Those who made less get nothing from this bill.

Lawmakers could have easily applied the increase to everyone. McHugh noted, by adjusting the formula for calculating benefit levels, but they didn't.

Then there are those lesser known little changes in the unemployment rules.

The one that bothers me the most is a new rule that severance pay must be used to offset unemployment benefits. Severance packages, McHugh explained, are often handed out by companies as a way of recognizing and rewarding loyalty and hard work over the years. Currently, separation pay isn't considered in the calculation of unemployment. From here on out, it will be treated like a paycheck before unemployment checks start going out to the laid off worker.

Why this is an issue isn't clear. Severance pay is voluntary for companies. The law doesn't require it.

Still, firms have shown a willingness to hand out such compensation despite the fact they know the jobless worker will head straight to the unemployment office to apply for benefits. Doubtlessly, they include that in their calculations of how much to give.

Throughout the debate, the Chamber has argued that "if you tax something, you get less of it." It was pointing out that higher costs for unemployment compensation could discourage hiring.

But the philosophy applies to severance pay and other rewards for hard work and loyalty. Tax it and you get less of that too.

There are a number of other little amendments to the law. A laid off works obligation to accept "suitable work" is increased. Requalification requirements are increased when an employee quits vol-

untarily or is fired for misconduct. In other words, they'll have to work longer at their next job in order to collect should they be laid off again later.

The new rules also shift the "burden of proof" to the worker in cases of a voluntary quit. In other words, in a dispute, the worker would have to prove the job loss was really the result of a lay off. That could be very difficult to do, especially if the notice of a lay off is given verbally rather than on paper.

In the end, it doesn't sound much like a program intended to help folks harmed by the after-shocks of terrorist attacks. It sounds like simple horse-trading. Benefits had been frozen in place since 1995, and if it was time to adjust them for inflation, the business community wanted something in return.

Nothing wrong with that. Happens all the time in Lansing.

But it doesn't qualify as altruism. And lawmakers should keep in check their claims about what they are doing to help the jobless.

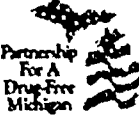

## Main Street to face ambitious project

Milford Downtown Development Authority is hoping to pave a beautiful new ground

Just as a flower needs someone to plant it, every gardener knows that a garden requires lots of hard work and planning. It's no different in the Village of Milford, which takes great pride in the beauty of its community.

For those who wonder about the many improvements in recent years, chances are the Downtown Development Authority, or DDA, is behind it in partnership with volunteers and other organizations.

DDA Director Ann Barnette notes that the many significant improvements to the community should serve as encouragement to residents as the village undertakes one of its most ambitious tasks, the revamping of the Main Street sidewalks and roads this year. The temporary inconveniences will be well worth the results, she assures.

As the center goes, so goes the rest of the community, said Barnette. Any improvements to the downtown area help the community to become stronger economically.

"The benefit will be for those 30,000 cars a day that come through our village. It's important that we put our best foot forward. Downtown is the heart of the community," said Denise Tyler, Chairperson of the DDA.

It's important that residents know the source of funding for planned or completed improvements, they believe. No tax dollars outside of the DDA District are used on these projects.

And due to the incredible generosity of volunteers, a lion's share of these endeavors has been completed with private donations. Barnette credits the Board of Directors for accomplishing incredible acquisitions when they're needed.

"When we do spend, we try to do it wisely. We continually search for grants or try to combine with public or private entities," she said.

Good examples of this include the DDA sponsored Center Street Park, which was created entirely by donated labor and material with wonderful results.

"Absolutely an incredible effort," said Barnette. Seventeen years later, the project is ready to be updated.

The largest undertaking to date was the Mill Pond Project and North Milford Road. The streetscape was funded entirely through grants, private donations

and volunteers. The road - the first DDA sponsored road - was completed in 28 days, a phenomenal task. The Main Street '02 project will offer a similar incentive of \$10,000 per day, every day the project is completed early.

An incentive penalty of \$3,000 per day helped to motivate the contractor to keep on a strict schedule. The Main Street '02 project will offer a similar incentive of \$10,000 per day, every day the project is completed early. Residents may have also noticed the improvements to the growing commercial area in the south side of town. This area received landscaping, plantings, trees, bricks, wrought iron fencing and lighting in 1993, encouraging other private investments such as Flats Grill, LaStrada and Milford Coffee Works.

The Union Street project is another area of significant improvements. Here they were also able to add 90 parking spaces without taking any land. Parking spaces and the general area was kept compact and condensed intentionally. Its purpose was safety and to keep the area more pedestrian friendly, said Barnette. "Functionally, it was a good project," she added.

As a person who grew up in Milford, there is a definite emotional attachment to the community for Barnette. She's had the unique vantage point of remem-

bering the past, while looking forward to the future for the village. And this includes growth. In addition to improvements, the DDA actively encourages developers to build structures compatible with existing structures in the village, sometimes through ordinance amendment or architectural review. While growth is inevitable, they believe it can be done in a way to enhance, not hinder the community.

"It's going to happen. It's going

to come. We're trying to make it as compatible as possible," Barnette said.

Sidewalk improvements are scheduled to begin the end of April and May, while the road will begin mid-August. The DDA reminds residents they will still have access to local businesses and encourages residents to continue to patronize them.

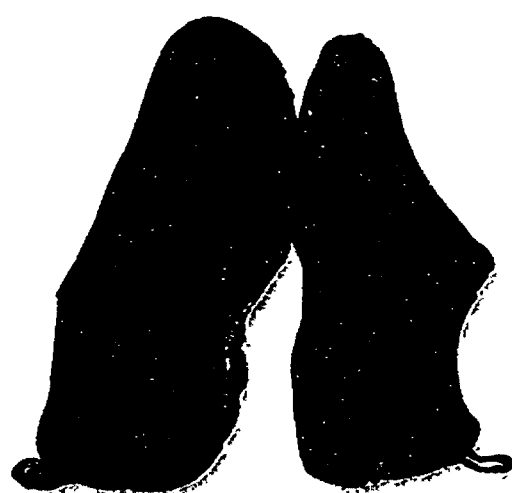

# Raiders repelled by Northville Mustangs

## Boys track team earns win in first meet of the 2002 season

It's always a great feeling when you can start your season off on a win — just ask the Northville Mustangs boys' track team.

The Northville boys' track and field team came out of the starting blocks on the right foot April 11 as they edged their way by the North Farmington Raiders 70-67 in a Western Lakes Activities Association contest before taking fifth in the Novi Relays just three days later.

"It came down to the mile relay," Northville coach Bill Cornelius said. "We won it by a yard or so with Patrick Kelleher running the anchor leg with Ben Maxim, Tim Dalton and Tim Higgins as the rest of the team."

The mile relay was all but neck and neck throughout the entire race with the Mustangs even seeing the back of a North Farmington Jersey now and again before Kelleher kicked it up a notch and ran his final leg in about 55 seconds to secure the win.

The Mustangs also took a big victory from Bill Brown, who won the 100 in a time of 11.3 seconds before notching a win in the 200 dash in 23.9. Brown was also the anchor leg of the 4-by-200 relay which ended up taking a first-place victory on the speed and determination of the young runner.

"When he got the baton he was about 20 meters behind," Cornelius said. "I didn't think he had a chance and I started to look over my clipboard, but he just kept coming and coming and ended up shocking everyone, including myself."

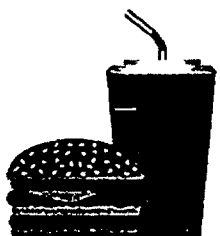
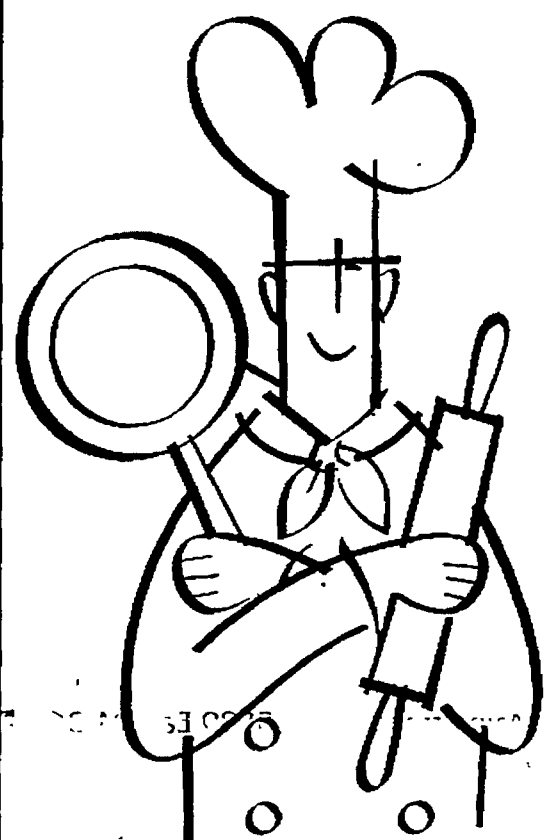

# Timberwolf terror

## Northville's Lauren Metaj sets scoring record at Northwood

It isn't everyday that a player can say they broke a university scoring record. Heck, most players don't even come close to touching such a record.

Don't tell that to the Northwood University Timberwolves' stellar basketball guard Lauren Metaj though. This Northville High School graduate set the all-time scoring record at Northwood University (6-19) with 1,465 total points.

"It was nothing I really aimed for during the season," said Metaj. "I would really have liked a better (season) record, but I realize this is a big accomplishment for me."

Metaj, who will be graduating from the university this May with a degree in marketing and management, finished her season with 14.3 points per game. She scored into double digits 72 times out of 103 career games. Besides being the all-time leading scorer for Northwood, Metaj also ranks third all-time for three-pointers with 143. The Northwood senior also collected 243 free throws, 473 rebounds, 196 assists and 202 steals through out her career at the university. Her personal best was 36 points, which she accomplished twice during her impressive college career.

"When I first walked in here I wasn't aware of the scoring record," Metaj said. "I played for the W more than for the points per game. It wasn't until this year when someone let me know that I knew I had a chance to break the record. It was then that I set it as a goal to aim for."

But even after breaking the scoring record, Metaj remains humble. She realizes that someone, someday, will come along and break her record as well — she just hopes it isn't for some time.

"Hopefully it takes a while," Metaj said. "I wish whoever tries for it the best. Northwood (women's basketball) has a lot of talent and a lot of good recruits. If someone else has a chance to do it, I wish them the best."

Metaj also noted that she wouldn't have even come close to breaking the record without the assistance and abilities of her teammates.

"I think they are the reason I broke the record," she said. "They had more than a lot to do with it. You win a game as a whole team, and that is how we broke the scoring record. They played unselfishly as much as I wanted to play unselfishly. I think everyone on this team had a part in it."

Metaj has earned the respect of her teammates, her coaches and her friends as well as the respect and admiration of those she once played for.

"Lauren was a scoring-type point guard that made all of her teammates better," coach Pete Wright said. "She saw the floor extremely well. Although she was able to score outside, Lauren was most comfortable taking the ball to the basket where she was an excellent finisher. She was very competitive and focused as well as an excellent leader. This was always evident by the way her team fed off her and the fact that she could take over a game."

Wright also noted that Metaj's ability to graduate from college this May shows her competitive nature and her strong will and desire.

"The fact that she was able to go to college and play basketball, which are two full-time jobs, and graduate on time this May is an outstanding accomplishment," he said.

With all of the accomplishments and praise Metaj has earned this season, would she trade it for anything? Perhaps a better season record for herself and her team?

"In a second," she said. "I wouldn't have cared if our leading scorer was our post player. I wanted us to make it to the (NCAA) tourney. It was a goal I set a long time ago, and it would have been great to get there. This is a nice accomplishment, but I would much rather have the wins."

Metaj noted that from the time she first picked up a basketball to now, the sport has been a huge factor in her life. She made friends, influenced teammates and even set records.

"I am going to miss it a lot," she said. "It has been something I have been doing my whole life. I am still playing here, getting in as many games and leagues as I can. I am going to miss it and this team a lot."

Having played from the time she was just a tyke through high school and now through college, Metaj has gathered a wealth of knowledge in the sport of basketball. The question, it seems, is if she is looking to pass such knowledge on in the form of coaching others?

"Definitely in the future, but not right now," Metaj said. "I want to wait and see how everything goes, but I will definitely coach in the future."

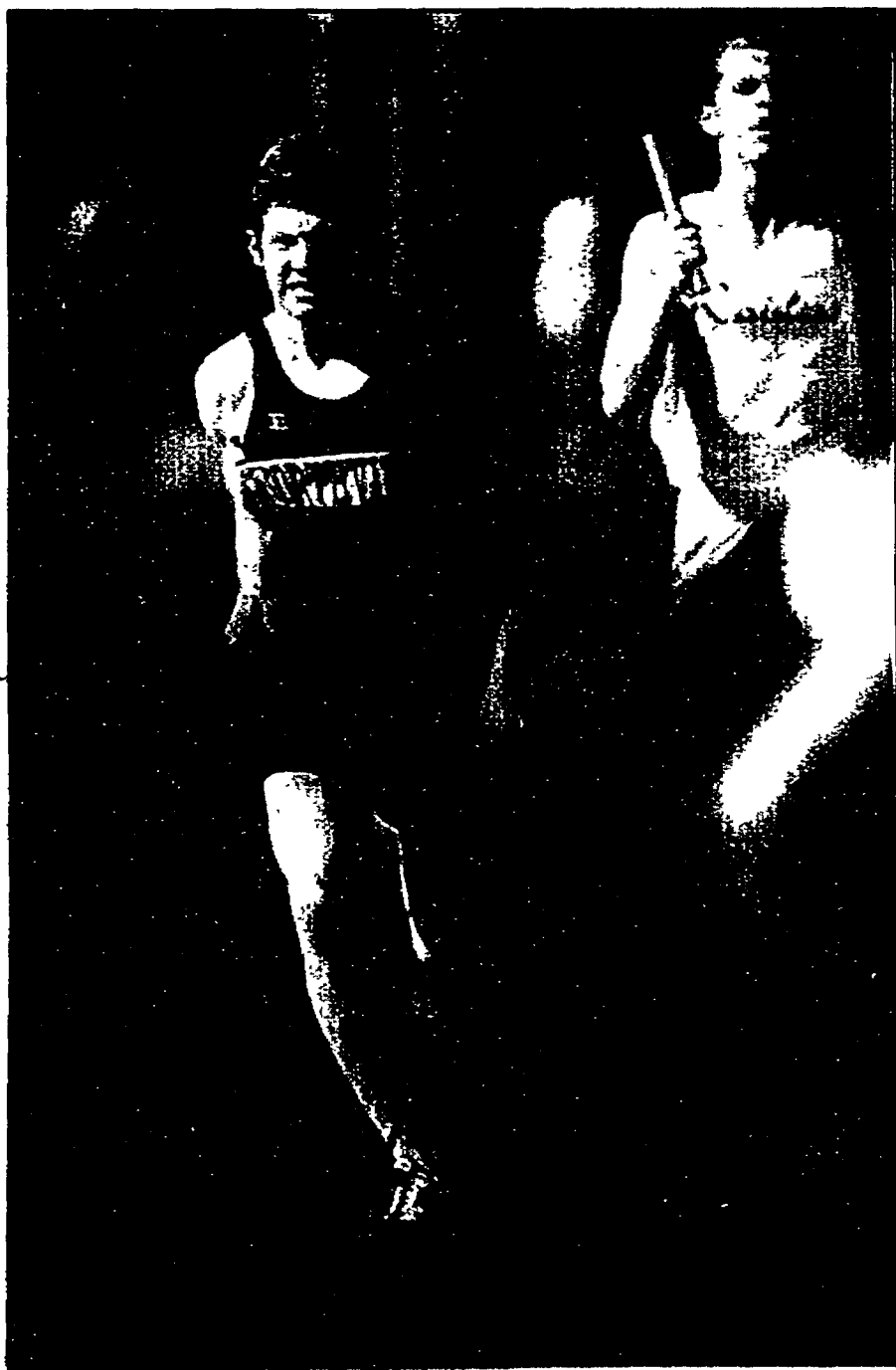

## WLW boys blast Central in track Warriors will be tough WLAA opponent

In a cross-town track rivalry last Thursday, the Walled Lake Western Warriors got the better of the Walled Lake Central, 83-54.

In the relay events, the Warriors dominated. They took first in the 3200-meter relay, 800-meter relay and the 400-meter relay. In both the 110 and the 300 hurdles, Central's

Chrzanowski took first and James Anderson took second.

"I was really pleased with how Bryan Chrzanowski and James Anderson ran the hurdles," Fras said.

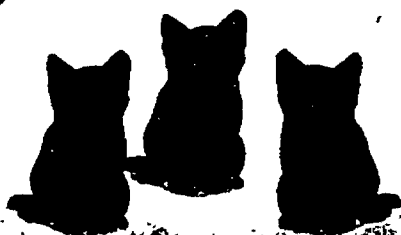

# Work out bugs

## Resorting to organic gardening

Few things — other than weeds, perhaps — frustrate gardeners more than when aphids, snails and other pests take up residence in the yard. Even the names of some pests sound menacing — root weevil, stem borer, cutworm. It's tempting to zap pests with highly toxic chemical products, but harsh chemicals also annihilate beneficial bugs and bacteria.

Organic, or nearly organic, gardening is a realistic goal for home gardeners. Many large-scale gardens are able to do it, and so can you. One famous example is the conservatory garden at Bellagio in Las Vegas. Enclosed by a 55-foot glass ceiling, the 13,500-square-foot garden is visited by guests round-the-clock. At any given time, the conservatory also is home to 8,000 potted color plants, in addition to greenery and trees. Floral displays are changed five times a year.

"Guests touch the plants quite a bit, and we don't want to expose them to chemicals," says Sharon Hatcher, Bellagio's horticulture manager.

At the Loews Coronado Bay Resort in Southern California, chemical-free pest control has become an integral part of the landscape to preserve the integrity of the resort's pride and joy: an enormous, fragrant herb garden from which chefs harvest herbs daily.

"It's not really an isolated garden, but part of the whole property, so we've minimized chemicals throughout the resort. We really do no spraying there," says Rene Mares, president of RBM Enterprises, which oversees the resort's landscaping. "Organic practices make the herbs taste better."

Much of what Hatcher and Mares

do to care for their showplace gardens can be put into practice in the home garden:

— **Smart design.** "The best way to avoid problems is to avoid plants that are prone to problems," says Mares. Pests will be less pervasive if you choose plants that are appropriate to your garden's climate and soil conditions than if you try to cultivate exotic plants. If your heart is set on a certain plant, but it won't thrive in your garden, consider alternatives.

"What do you want from that plant in your garden? Often you can find an alternative with similar effects but fewer problems," says Mares. Also steer clear of any weak or infected plants.

"We inspect our plant materials before we put them in the conservatory," says Hatcher.

— **Attack infestation immediately.** Inspect plants regularly for signs of pests, and handpick or spot treat pests. Prune infested leaves and branches. If necessary, remove the entire plant so infestation can't spread to the rest of the garden.

— **Water and fertilize wisely.** Over-watering creates fungus, while overzealous fertilization encourages new growth that pests love. Put plants on a watering and fertilization schedule that is appropriate.

— **Introduce natural predators.** "People are surprised that we release bugs in the conservatory," says Hatcher. Ladybugs, lacewing larvae, nematodes (roundworms) and even predatory mites and natural bacteria that feed on insects are used in Bellagio's conservatory. Gardeners also use horticultural oils, such as mineral oil, to suffocate bugs. Sprays made with neem (derived from the

neem tree) and pepper (such as Hot Pepper Wax, which contains cayenne pepper also remove pests. In addition to ladybugs, Mares recommends wasps and praying mantises. Check with your local nursery to find beneficial bugs for your area. Need to monitor the level of pest infestation in your yard? Hatcher recommends using brightly colored sticky traps (available at nurseries), which attract insects.

— **Use chemicals only as a last resort.** If prevention and careful monitoring don't keep pests at bay, you may need to resort to a chemical solution. "Use chemicals in limited quantities in a very controlled way," says Mares. Instead of using a hose attachment to spray the whole garden with insecticide, use a squirt bottle to apply a small amount to the infected area. Chemical-free pest control has another benefit: a chemical-free garden attracts pests' natural predators, including birds, toads, beneficial bugs and even bats.

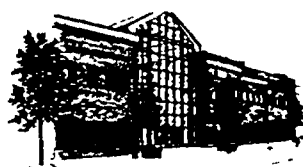

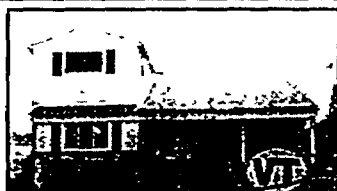

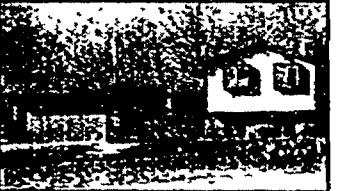

# San Pablo is ideal starter

The compact San Pablo D6807 is an ideal starter home featuring the classic lines so familiar across the Southwest. It has a tile roof, colonial-style porch and brick accents across its face.

The San Pablo is uniquely attractive. It has 1,528 square feet of space and is ideal for a retiree looking to build in a warmer climate.

Next to its covered porch is a large planter that catches the eye as one enters the San Pablo. The entry opens into a huge great room that occupies the center of the home.

## Many prize Hardy Boys memorabilia

There is a certain group of names that automatically calls to mind the idealized all-American early 20th-century boy: Clean-cut, honest, resourceful and brave — the Horatio Alger heroes, Tom Swift, Frank Merriwell and the Hardy Boys. The series of books starring the righteous Hardy brothers, nominally authored by Franklin W. Dixon (more about that later), debuted in 1927, and, like their female parallel Nancy Drew, the boys were still solving crimes on TV decades later.

Frank and Joe Hardy are the teen-aged sons of Detective Fenton Hardy. With the help of their friend Chet Morton, they solve crime after crime with great ingenuity and fortitude. But back to Franklin W. Dixon. Alas, there never was such a person. Like Arthur Winfield (the Rover Boys) and Laura Lee Hope (the Bobsey Twins), Dixon was a pseudonym created by Edward Stratemeyer's Stratemeyer Syndicate which, beginning in 1906, churned out the above series as well as the Tom Swift and Nancy Drew books. Stratemeyer himself conceived the characters and created the outlines for the first Hardy stories, which were then ghostwritten by a Canadian named Leslie McFarland, who wrote many of the books published between 1927 and 1947.

The initial three volumes to appear in 1927 — and now the most collectible — were "The Tower Treasure," "The House on the Cliff" and

"The Secret of the Old Mill." They all followed a winning formula — appealing characters, exciting plots, and effective prose. All in all, there were almost 400 titles published in several different series, making the Hardy Boys the longest-running and best-selling series of books for boys ever.

After early exposure to "The Mickey Mouse Club" in the '50s, the Hardy Boys made two appearances on the small screen in the 1970s. First there was a Saturday morning cartoon series in which the young sleuths were part of a rock band known as — what else? — the Hardy Boys. Then, in 1977, the brothers alternated, and then teamed up, with their old Stratemeyer contemporary, Nancy Drew, for "The Hardy Boys/Nancy Drew Mysteries." This time they were live, with Parker Stevenson playing Frank and Shaun Cassidy as Joe Hardy, which they did for two seasons.

When Stevenson and especially Cassidy became teen-girl heartthrobs, it wasn't long before there was an outpouring of merchandise with their idols' pictures on it. Among the more collectible items are the steel lunch box and plastic thermos issued by King-Seelye Thermos in 1977: "The Hardy Boys Mystery Game, The Secret of Thunder Mountain," marketed by Parker Brothers in 1978; and the "Hardy Boys Van" plastic assembly kit by Revell Plastics, 1977. Harking back to their rock star incarnation is the 1970 Corgi set consisting of figures representing all the members of their group and a replica of a 1912

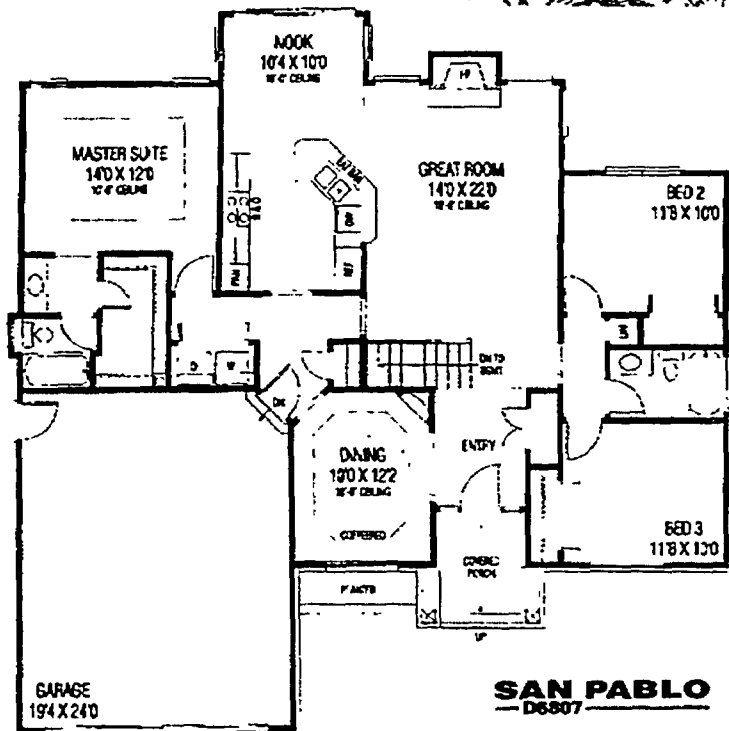
Rolls Royce Silver Ghost touring car.

In addition, there are Hardy Boys activity books ("Hardy Boys Baffling Word Webs," "Hardy Boys Mystery Mazes,") costumes and clothing, iron-on patches, pillowcases, mirrors, a Shaun Cassidy guitar by Carnival Toys, posters and puzzles, a portable AM radio with a photo of Shaun, jewelry and watches.

### REFERENCE

For a guide to all the various children's book series, a useful book is "Boys & Girls' Book Series, Real World Adventures" by Diane McClure Jones and Rosemary Jones (Collector Books). In addition to identifying and giving values for series ranging from the well-known — Bobsey Twins, Tom Swift, Nancy Drew and Dick and Jane — there is a wealth of other mystery and adventure heroes and heroines, such as Dick and Janet Cherry, Dick Arnold, Dick Hamilton, Dick Kent, Dick Prescott, Dick Travers and Jane Allen and Jane Stuart. Illustrated with scores of covers in full color, the book also provides a concise history of American children's book publishing and publishers, a glossary and a list of resources.

## how to lay pavers

Once the edging is in place spread gravel evenly until you have a bed 4 inches deep.

Compact gravel with a hand tamper until you have a firm packed base.

Don't forget to check the slope.

Notch the ends of a long 2' x 4' so the depth of the notch is equal to the depth of the brick, stone, or paver. Add sand to the top of the gravel. Level the sand by resting the notches on top of the edging and drawing the board back and forth until the sand is smooth.

Start laying the bricks from one corner, spacing them 1/8" apart or less. If you are working on a large patio, run a mason's line across the patio, marking the edge of the bricks.

Use a rubber mallet to tap bricks into the sand bed.

As you lay rows, keep checking the patio for high and low spots by putting a straight 2' x 4' or a level across the bricks. Seat high spots with a tap from a rubber mallet. Add sand to shore up low spots.

When all the bricks have been laid, pour fine sand—often sold as mason's sand or silica—across the patio. With a stiff brush or broom, brush the patio surface until the joints between the bricks are filled. Once the tamping is finished, mist the patio with water to help the sand settle.
