Accident takes woman's life

A car accident in the city of Novi took the life of a Northville woman last week after the sedan she was driving crossed into oncoming traffic and crashed into a garbage truck, police said.

Sandra Jean Marzen, 41, was pronounced dead at the scene.

Detective Sgt. David Molloy of the Novi police Department said alcohol did not appear to be a factor, although the department is still waiting on toxicology results from the Oakland County Medical Examiners Office for verification.

"She was swerving a little bit and then she hit the truck," said Michael Gibbs, an employee of Pyramid Sprinklers, who was working near the scene of the accident. "There was nothing we could do. We tried talking to her and keeping her awake, but

she had a very faint pulse and too many puncture wounds."

Gibbs and fellow employee Paul Beach said the woman tried to speak to them, but was unable to get anything out.

"We tried telling her that help was on the way and that everything was going to be okay," Gibbs said. "I hope she believed in God."

Dispatchers from the Novi Police Department received a call at about 9:10 a.m. on July 11 from a man saying he saw a blue Saturn driving erratically south on Novi Road between Nine and Ten Mile roads.

Novi dispatchers said while they were talking to the man, another call came in stating a car matching the same description had just hit a garbage truck on Novi Road south of Ten Mile.

Novi investigators at the scene determined Marzen was traveling southbound on Novi Road when she crossed the center-

line, striking the front left side of the garbage truck, which was traveling north on the same road.

Witnesses said neither vehicles contained passengers, the airbags in the Saturn did deploy and the Northville woman was wearing her seat belt.

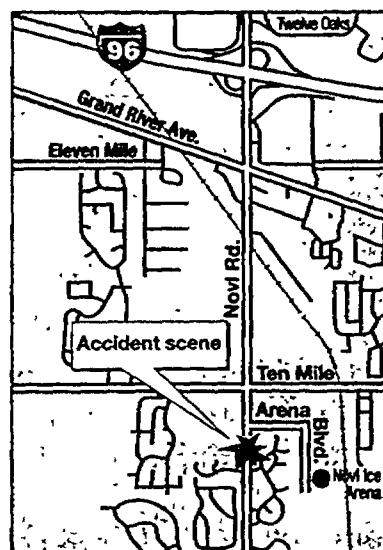
According to information in Marzen's driving record, the woman had eight automobile accidents in the past seven years.

Police said the 39-year-old Carleton male driving the Republic Waste Services truck reported no injuries.

Novi Road was closed for more than three hours during the investigation.

Township prepared to give abatement to tech firm

Northville Township is preparing to grant a six-year tax abatement to a local automotive supplier after comments are heard at tonight's public hearing to be held during the regularly scheduled board meeting.

ZF Technologies, which is based in Kentucky, also operates facilities in Northville and Auburn Hills. A release last week announced last week that the company will receive a tax credit from the Michigan Economic Growth Authority Board, or what is also referred to as a MEGA grant, based on local participation.

"We want to stay ahead of the game and we need the best engineers we can get," said ZF North America communications and marketing director Wolfgang Schmid. "The tax credit will certainly help us further achieve our goal to be one of the top-15 global automotive suppliers."

ZF Technologies will only benefit from those opportunities if the tax abatement is approved by board officials.

"Our participation would be to give them a tax abatement," said assistant township manager and finance director Thelma Kubitskey, explaining that the tax break would include all taxing entities. "It's a good thing for the township. It's a way for the township to work with the state of Michigan and it's also a way to bring more research and development into the township."

The company plans to use the credit to consolidate and expand the company's research and development capabilities by investing \$16.4 million in a new research and development facility and \$11.4 million in machinery and equipment. ZF Technologies anticipates creating up to 230 jobs in the next five years.

Township superintendent Mark Abbo said that ZF Technologies was offered to MEGA grant because the state of Michigan is interested in having the company expand its business within state lines.

"The township is doing this for two purposes," said Abbo. "We are interested in assisting a local business and we are interested in work-

Even so, water cutback isn't odd

City, township join ranks of every-other-day outdoor H2O use

Hot sun and green grass.

Because of the first, the second may be just a bit harder to maintain due to the recent mandatory odd/even outdoor water restrictions placed on all 126 communities within Wayne, Oakland, Macomb, St. Clair, Lapeer, Genesee, Washtenaw, and Monroe Counties. The restrictions are supported by the Detroit Water and Sewage Department, the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality, and the Southeast Michigan Water Task Force.

The odd/even restriction calls for residents and businesses with addresses ending in odd numbers to use outdoor water only on odd-numbered calendar days and those whose addresses end in even num-

bers to follow the same guideline. All water customers are also asked to limit or avoid outdoor water use during the peak hours of 6 a.m. to 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. daily.

"It's almost a yearly thing now," said Jim Gallogly, the city's director of public works. "With all the development in the area

and the demand for water during these dry spells, the demand for water is far greater than the Detroit water systems can provide."

Gallogly said that as long as the restrictions are followed, the community will have no problem with keeping water pressures and providing for Northville's domestic water needs.

"We've had these in the past and anticipated that we'd have this issue this summer," said Don Weaver, township director of public services. "We're just asking for everybody's cooperation."

Both the city and the township plan to strictly enforce the water restrictions while they are in effect.

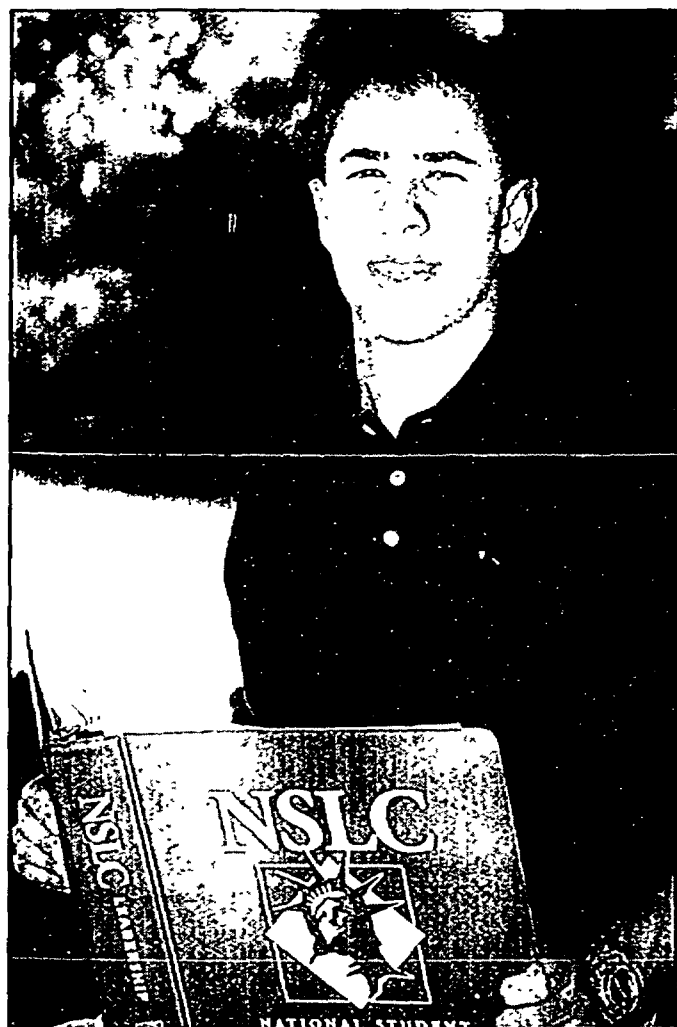

Student attends U.S. leadership conference

Northville High School senior Ryan Deutschendorf recently attended the National Student Leadership Conference on Medicine and Health Care in Washington, D.C.

In late June, Deutschendorf participated in the NSLC program which is designed to help teach high-school age students how to become effective leaders and further develop those skills and abilities.

His mother, Joanne Deutschendorf, said Ryan was recommended for the program by one of his teachers.

"Sometimes teachers recommend you and then you have to fill out an application and [submit] letters of recommendation," she said. "He loved it. He really enjoyed it."

During Deutschendorf's stay, he participated in several courses including leadership development, communication, medical ethics, medical research and patient care

simulations.

He was also involved with educational tours and trips during his venture.

In addition, students had the opportunity to listen to guest speakers and various lecturers.

"I enjoyed it a lot," said Deutschendorf, 16. "I met kids from all over the country and the world."

He said program participants came from such places as Australia, Japan and the Virgin Islands. Students also came from the distant U.S. states of Hawaii and Alaska.

During the conference session, Deutschendorf said he was able to see monuments in Washington D.C. and toured Johns Hopkins University.

Deutschendorf also said he had the opportunity to do research and conduct a presentation.

"We went to the medical museum and did research on genetic enhancement," he said.

For Deutschendorf, the opportunity to attend the medical conference further encouraged him to pursue a potential career in medicine. "I think you learn a lot and it

gives you a chance to learn about the medical field," he said. "I'd like to be a surgeon. It kind of backed it up on what I'd decided."

Deutschendorf also said he traveled with another Northville High School student Navin Bora.

According to NSLC officials, students attended special workshops and classes where they studied the "distinctions of leadership."

Officials said the mission of the NSLC is to identify and recognize outstanding young leaders from around the world and to provide them with a unique learning environment that encourages not only academic achievement, but diversity, cooperation and social responsibility.

Officials also said by participating in this program, students develop abilities to think on their feet, engage in critical analysis and communicate effectively.

School board reshuffles executive officers

School board members shifted their appointed stations in preparation for a new year of service at the board's Tuesday evening meeting.

The results of the board reshuffling was publicly announced at Old Village School. Judy Handley was elected to the position of president, Judith Wollack was appointed vice-president, Gregory Pelc was named secretary and Jerry Rupley remains treasurer for the school board.

Trustees will include Joan Wadsworth, Karen Paciorek and Ken Roth.

Board members said they were anticipating their new responsibilities.

"It's exciting," said vice-president Judith Wollack, who will begin her third year of service on the board. "It will be a new experience."

Wollack said she is looking forward to the multiple construction projects in the works for the district and the arrival of the new elementary school.

In addition, Wollack said she is pleased to have two new faces join the school board.

"I'm looking forward to adding our new board members," she said. "I think that will be exciting. Martha and Tom were wonderful board members and did a great job and it's wonderful we replaced them with two very qualified candidates who will both bring a variety of new experiences."

Board member Gregory Pelc was appointed to the position of secretary for the upcoming school year, a position he has never held before.

"I've been a trustee all the time," said Pelc. "This is going to be my first time holding one of the other offices. I'm looking forward to it."

Pelc was elected to the board in 1999.

He also said that he is anticipating the construction ventures and making sure the projects are completed in a timely fashion.

"We'll be working on the weighted grades situation too," he said.

Jerry Rupley will remain the school board treasurer for the upcoming school year.

"It's what I do," said Rupley, adding that this will be his fourth year serving the board. "It's something I feel fairly comfortable with. It's also easy working with John Street."

Rupley said there are a number of tasks currently facing the district.

"We've got the construction projects and the bond issue," he said. "We want to get those done. We'll continue to work with the grading committee on grading K-12 and getting consistent grading matrices established across the K-12 system and exploring the weighted grades in that context. There's going to be some challenges in the budget area, given the continued weakness in the economy. That

affects the state's revenues and therefore our revenue."

Judy Handley has been appointed to fill the position of school board president.

"I am excited about it," said Handley, who has been serving on the Northville Board of Education since 1997. "It will be a personal challenge for me."

Handley said this will be her first time serving as board president.

"This is a position I really thought long and hard about because I don't want to let anybody down," she said. "I want to make sure that I have the time to give attention to the issues that really need to be dealt with. I look at it as a challenge, but an exciting opportunity. I think it's an honor to serve the community."

Handley said a busy academic year lies ahead with the building additions taking place and the construction of the district's sixth elementary school, Ridge Wood.

"Our plate is very full with that," she said. "In terms of curricular issues, the grading committee will have a significant job ahead of them."

USPS: watch for vandalism

Vandalizing mailboxes is no longer a laughing matter. Although the Northville community is not experiencing an unusual rate of vandalism, Northville postmaster Emily Liedel hopes to increase community awareness as to the seriousness of the crime.

It was once considered to be a rite of passage for teens to lean out of car windows and knock mailboxes down along the way. In the past, most peo-

ple would only look the other way unless it was their own mailbox that had been vandalized.

But things have changed. Mailboxes are considered to be federal property and crimes committed against them are therefore considered a federal offense. People are no longer being so tolerant and arrests are being made.

"The problems we have been experiencing with pipe bombs across the country not only cause delays in mail delivery but it also affects the home-

owner and the postal workers," said Liedel. "The disruption is a cost to the postal service."

Costs are also incurred by the homeowners whose mailboxes are damaged. Liedel said cost of replacing damaged mailboxes usually falls on them.

Violators can be fined up to \$10,000 and imprisoned for up to 10 years for each act of vandalism. The penalties become more severe when someone is injured as a result of the vandalism. Liedel hopes that parents

will stop mailbox vandalism before it starts by discussing the penalties with them and making them aware that the Postal Service is aggressive about prosecution.

"It's always been a federal offense," said Liedel. "We just want to make the community aware of the seriousness of the act."

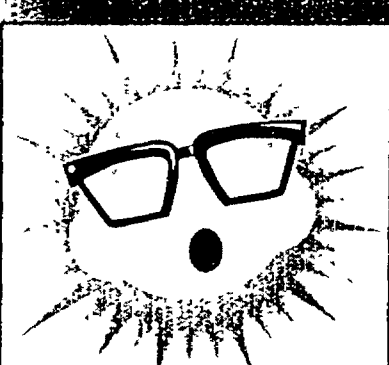

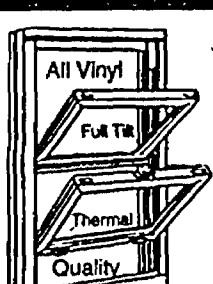

Resident off to Honduras for Peace Corps

Northville resident Adrienne Frogner-Howell will have just a few weeks to celebrate her recent graduation from the University of Michigan before she has to pack her bags for Honduras and the Peace Corps.

"I have always been interested in traveling, learning about and immersing myself in a new culture," said the 21-year-old who will be working as a health extension volunteer. While in Honduras, Frogner-Howell will be living with a host family and provided a monthly stipend based

on the country's economic stability.

Frogner-Howell said she has always had an interest in international health and knew she wanted to join the Peace Corps two years ago. After filling out an application in the Peace Corps' recruiter's office located on U-M's campus, Frogner-Howell had to wait to be interviewed, nominated by a recruiter, fingerprinted, and fill out forms about her experiences. Once she found out she had been accepted, Frogner-Howell was then able to express her preference on which world regions in which she wished to serve.

"It's a long process," she said. "It took me over a year from the day I turned in the application and the day I found out where I was going."

Peace Corps recruiter Lisa Bobrowski said that the process designed to take that long in order to give the applicants the time

needed to decide if the Peace Corps is right for them. Bobrowski explained that although the Peace Corps looks at experience and education in each of its applicants, they are not the only factors.

"We also look at their emotional maturity because they are spending that time of two years away from their family and friends," she said.

Frogner-Howell believes she is prepared for that. With the only round trip ticket provided by the Peace Corps being the one that will get her to Honduras and home after her two years are up, seeing her family will be expensive. But she plans to use the two days of vacation time per month she will accumulate to see her family whenever possible.

"We have discussed meeting in a neighboring country or possible Miami since it is only five hours away," she said. "But we haven't discussed my coming

back to the Detroit area or Northville yet."

Although Frogner-Howell has visited third world countries before, she said she has never lived in one. Her visits have given her an idea of what to expect but she does realize that she is not fully prepared. Frogner-Howell said she plans to use the other people in her training group as

well as her host family as resources for adjustment.

Frogner-Howell is scheduled to leave on July 22 for a few days of training in Miami before she is leaves for Honduras. She will go through three more months of training once she arrives before she begins her two years of service.

"I have always been interested

in international health and development and wanted to get out there and do something," said Frogner-Howell. "I'm excited and nervous but I'm ready."

For the GOP: vote Schwarz

No characteristic is more important in a candidate for elective office than integrity. And as Republican voters head to the polls Aug. 6 to choose their nominee to run for the post of Michigan's governor, they should be looking for the candidate with that quality first.

That candidate is JOE SCHWARZ.

"The sheer act of holding office is not the be all and the end all in this world," he said. "The sheer act of telling the truth is — let the chips fall where they may. I'm perfectly happy to stay in Battle Creek, practice medicine, grow roses, attend University of Michigan football games and have the occasional cold beer. It will be just fine. In the interim, I'm going to tell it the way I believe it is."

Schwarz believes Michigan's GOP has moved too far to the right. His opponent, he believes, represents a continued slide in that direction, and therefore would be "unelectable" in the general election runoff in the fall.

We agree. After 10 years of domination by the Republican party in the halls of the Capitol, the next governor cannot count on such complete control of the legislative process. And even if the GOP keeps its edge in Lansing after the next election, the movement should be toward inclusion.

Schwarz represents that more moderate view of the Republican agenda, a move toward the center.

Schwarz certainly has the experience working with the legislature and the legislative process; he has served in the state senate since 1986, elected to the post of President Pro Tem of the Senate every year since 1993.

His resume lists terms as a City Commissioner and Mayor of the City of Battle Creek, so he understands local government as well.

Schwarz' resume also includes a great deal of time serving as a physician at a

variety of Battle Creek area hospitals. In fact, the doctor retains his private practice to this day. Although he says he'll have to give up his practice if elected governor, Schwarz has an intimate knowledge of what is needed to address the looming problems of Medicaid, health care and health care insurance. Among the proposals he favors is the development of more Federal Qualified Health Centers to provide treatment to the uninsured, so they will not have to use costly emergency room services that put so many Michigan hospitals in a financial bind.

One of the uncomfortable truths Schwarz is talking about is his belief that the state budget remains badly out of balance. Despite recent action in the legislature to increase tobacco taxes and trim programs, he contends the budget will still fall short some \$970 million.

Schwarz advocates instead the relatively painless solution of delaying scheduled rollbacks in income tax and Single Business Tax rates for just a couple of years.

Schwarz ranks as a fiscal conservative, and has shown over the years he is careful with the taxpayer's dollar.

On the issue of abortion, Schwarz classifies himself as pro-choice, saying that abortions should be available, safe and rare.

Polls clearly indicate that Schwarz is the dark horse in this race. But a nomination for his opponent would continue the slide to the right for the GOP, a trend that needs to be moderated.

Naming Schwarz as the nominee would represent a badly needed move toward the center, and would bring the party back to a position of representing the remainder of the state.

Our endorsement goes to JOE SCHWARZ.

For the Dems: vote Granholm

Democratic voters in the August gubernatorial primary should select Attorney General JENNIFER GRANHOLM, who is the most thoughtful and articulate candidate, and the one most willing to talk about the issues and their specifics in depth.

After a decade of one-party domination in state government, Michigan also needs a moderate in the governor's office, a need Granholm both fills and understands.

"I have been just floored in Lansing with the partisan acrimony that exists," she said in an interview with our editorial board. "People spend their waking hours trying to figure out how to get the other guy instead of trying to figure out how to serve. What a ridiculous situation that is. I would hope that I could come in and appeal to people who are fresh and who are coming in with great ideas and great hopes for changing the world, rather than gaining a political advantage."

In fact, "inclusion/diversity" is one of the "five core values" around which her campaign revolves.

"In my opinion, the best ideas are born of a diverse exchange of views. If everyone around the table looks and sounds and thinks the same, the resulting ideas will be the 'same old thing,'" she said.

The other values include "creativity/outside-the-box thinking," integrity, engagement and excellence.

Her stance as a moderate is also reflected in her positions on the issues. She opposes the recent tax hikes intended to solve the state's budget crunch, and further argues that the Single Business Tax should be eliminated. While understanding of the concerns of school districts which are asking for changes to Proposal A, Granholm "would not return to a millage-based system for funding our schools." Rather, she would like schools to have more options for making capital improvements and allow for the creation of foundations to which residents could contribute to support school district programs.

She has laid out intricate plans for addressing issues such as economic development, urban sprawl and controlling the cost of health care.

Unlike many politicians, Granholm allows her views to evolve as more information becomes available. Very visible as an opponent of concealed weapons legislation, Granholm now says the problems she feared and predicted have not come true. She says she is now taking a "wait and see" approach to the reformed CCW laws.

JENNIFER GRANHOLM will serve the Democratic party best in the coming general election. Furthermore, she's best suited to serve the state as a whole, should she win the day in November.

Political reform goes in cycles

We're rapidly approaching the Aug. 6 primary election. Here's a timely quiz for politically attuned readers, followed by a short essay based on the answers.

Who said which of the following?

a) "What do the American people want in their candidates? Straight talk; the unvarnished truth; certainly not some kind of harsh ideology. ... People may not agree with everything good candidates say, but people should place a high premium on candidates with high moral and ethical standards, the kind of people you can take at their word."

b) "This is a contest for the soul of the Republican Party. The party has moved further and further to the right, while the electorate has moved closer and closer to the center. ... If we continue to be moral absolutists, we'll be toast in November."

c) "I've never seen a candidate who stands for the things that are important to Michigan and couples that with undoubted honesty, integrity and commitment to principle."

If you picked U.S. Senator John McCain for (a), gubernatorial candidate State Sen. John J.H. ("Joe") Schwarz for (b) and former governor William G. Milliken (endorsing Schwarz for governor) for (c) you'd go

to the top of the class.

What brought them all together? They're all moderate Republicans, an increasingly rare breed, gathered together in Michigan last Monday to promote Schwarz's candidacy for the GOP nomination for governor. For three remarkably distinguished, able and respected politicians, they got remarkably little ink or airtime from the media.

That's too bad, because what they're really working on is an attempt to moderate the steady drift to the right of the Republican Party, nationally and in Michigan. Schwarz makes no bones about it.

"My party is increasingly in the control of single issue groups like Right to Life and the pro-gun folks who may provide active and motivated foot soldiers in primary elections, but who do not represent the increasingly independent mainstream voters in America," he said.

I spent some time with Schwarz and McCain as their campaign bus careened from Detroit Metro Airport to Pleasant Ridge and then to Ann Arbor. We talked about political reform in general and the Republican Party in particular.

Both seemed hopeful in their reform mission, if only because they both believe that Republican candidates who come across as moral absolutists may win primaries but are likely to lose in general elections come November. "What's the best way to get across your message of reform?" responded McCain at one point. "Pointing out that hard-line ideologues lose general elections. That wakes folks up right quick."

They cited polling data indicating that voters registering as Independent now make up a larger group than either Democrats or Republicans, especially in Michigan, a famous ticket-splitting state. They argued

the best way to attract Independent voters is for candidates to be "centrist," to downplay ideology and to demonstrate character and integrity — "to be comfortable in their own skin." And they both referred to former President Theodore Roosevelt, who tried (and ultimately failed) to reform the Republican Party after the turn of the century, as their hero.

Our conversation reminded me of what some Democrats were talking about 20 years ago: That their party had moved much too far to the left to appeal to mainstream Americans, that absolutist liberal ideologues had taken over the party, that there had to be a way to generate new ideas to pull the party to the center.

Eventually, the Democratic Leadership Council, a think-and-act group, took up the task. It did the spadework on welfare reform, on job training as an investment in human capital, on free trade, on protecting the environment and providing ways for sustainable economic growth. Eventually, these ideas found a voice in Bill Clinton, who pulled his party to the center and, in so doing, got himself elected and re-elected President.

Thankfully, political reform goes in cycles. One generation deals with one party, the next generation with the other. These days, it's the Republican Party that's in need of reform. And the combination of John McCain, Bill Milliken and Joe Schwarz struck me as an awfully compelling lineup to make the case.

We're changing with the Times

No, you're not imagining things. The *Northville Record* is smaller today.

And while I'll venture a guess that the July 18, 2002 edition of the *Record* won't be considered a collector's item, it is the first edition of the newspaper which shrinks down the dimensions of the newsprint.

If you're a real newspaper geek, the technical term for this new size is a "50-inch web." The name has nothing to do with the physical size of the paper, since even broadsheet newspapers

are only 22½ inches long. No, actually I'm pretty sure it's got some relation to what those wacky press people do when the paper is sent off to be printed.

(NOTE TO PRESS FOLKS: It's a joke. Really. Don't hurt me.)

I alluded to this pending change a few months ago. Before I knew it, mid-July was upon me, and I knew the alteration to the familiar broadsheet-size newspaper would be coming any day. That day is today.

I'd be lying if I said that economics wasn't

part of the impetus for the transformation. Newsprint ain't cheap, and much like a two-by-four isn't two inches-by-four inches (it isn't — measure it yourself if you don't believe me) to save some money along the way, newspapers can do the same thing by trimming a bit here and a smidgen there. Multiply that over 8,000 copies over 52 weeks, and the savings start adding up.

Money isn't the alpha and omega, though. Surveys taken among newspaper readers across the country have shown that a smaller newspaper is preferable. A psychologist could explain why that is. (I sure as heck can't.) And as a result, scores of newspapers have jumped on the 50-inch bandwagon. If anything, we dragged our heels a bit.

But newsprint size is not the only change we've made. We've also modified the type style utilized for body copy of the newspaper. For nearly the entire life of the *Record*, the font of choice was Bookman, which looked like this:

Ash trees are not a bore-ing story

Late-breaking news. It turns the editor's hair gray, but it also is what keeps this a "news" paper.

When staff writer Victoria Sadlocha penned a *Novi News* front page article on the decline of the city's ash trees, *Novi City Forester*

Steve Printz was still waiting to hear confirmation of the official cause of the problem.

Now we know. It's a new exotic pest from Asia called *Agilus planipennis*, or the Emerald Ash Borer.

It is wreaking havoc, so much that Michigan officials have issued a quarantine on all ash trees, branches, logs and firewood may not be moved outside the affected counties of Oakland, Livingston, Wayne, Washtenaw and Macomb.

To help prevent and control the spread of this pest, ash trees, branches, logs and firewood may not be moved outside the affected area unless certified for movement by the Michigan Department of Agriculture.

This is serious stuff, folks, and we implore

everyone to abide by these restrictions.

In fact, the state's director of MDA's Pesticide and Plant Pest Management Division, Ken Rauscher, has initiated an Invasive Species Emergency Response Plan, which includes the creation of an Emerald Ash Borer Task Force.

The group conducted detection surveys over the past two weeks to determine the borer's range and extent of damage, and found it in the above five counties in white, green or black ash trees.

This pest is not native to our state or anywhere else in this country. With the assistance of Asian entomologists, the U.S. Dept. of Agriculture officially identified the culprit as the Emerald Ash Borer, which belongs to a group of insects known as metallic wood-boring beetles.

Homeowners and landscapers in Southeast Michigan have been plagued by loss of ash trees for the last few years. Specialists initially looked at a combination of disease, drought and poor soil as causes of the problem. This borer is a likely reason as well.

To identify the Emerald Ash Borer, look for a dark metallic green color, approximately 1/8 inch long and about 1/16 inch wide. The larvae are creamy white and found under the bark.

The borer usually goes undetected until the trees start showing symptoms of being infected. Usually the upper third of a tree will think and then die back. This is followed by a large number of shoots or branches arising below the dead portion of the trunk.

So now you know what to look for and you know to be responsible and keep this

pest contained to this area so the impact on our state's ash trees and nursery and landscape industries is kept to a minimum.

If you spot signs of the Emerald Ash Borer elsewhere, call the state's toll-free hotline at (866) 325-0023. More information can be found online at www.michigan.gov/mda using the key word "ash borer."

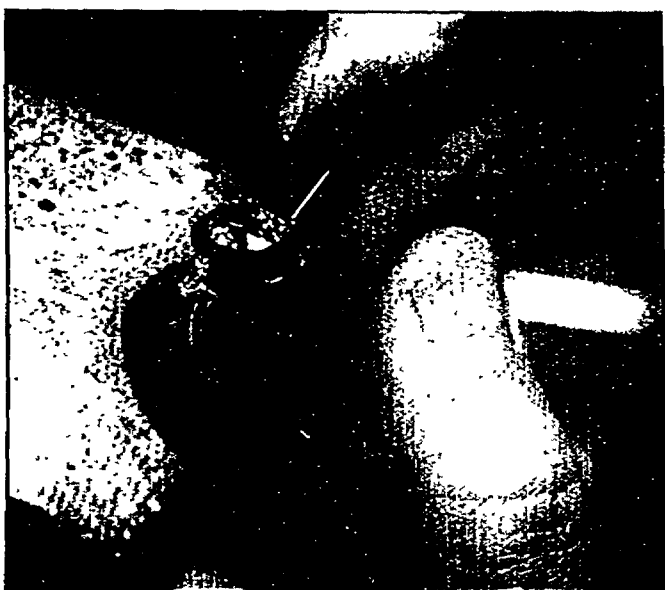

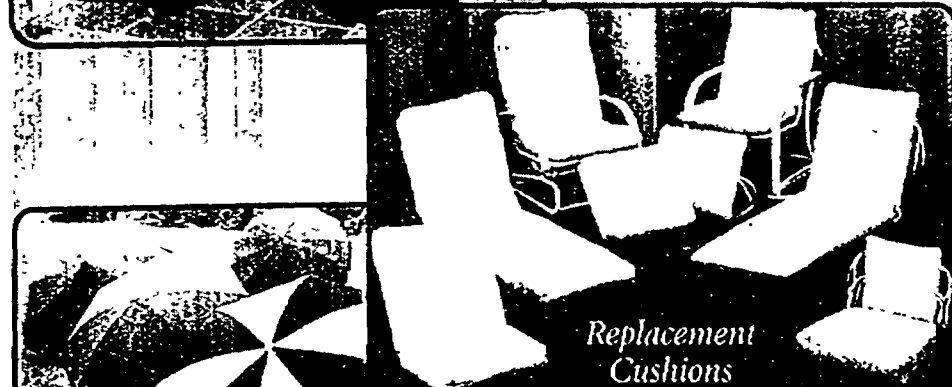

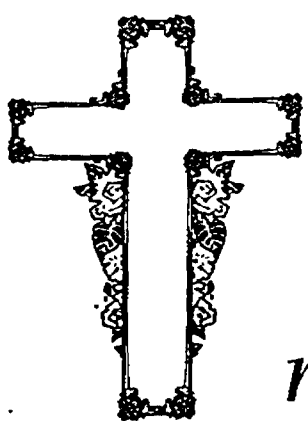

Lights, Camera, Action! Welcome to The Screen Beat! Each week we'll take a look at what's playing at your local theater and perhaps review the new DVD/Video releases for your home entertainment.

To give you a little background info, I'm Brian Renner and I attend Novi High School. I am a movie fan and have combined my computer knowledge with my constant quest for the latest news in the entertainment industry. For several years, I have owned and operated a Web site, THEMOVIEINSIDER.COM, which contains a comprehensive array of reviews and information about new releases in film. The site includes message forums where visitors can express their opinions on hot movie related topics and features interviews with industry professionals, actors and actresses, as well as up-and-coming filmmakers.

Tough to Compare

'Perdition' can't compete with Coppola's 'Godfather,' but should have good run against summer releases

Despite its effort to stand next to the classics of American cinema, "Road to Perdition" is on the inevitable road to oblivion.

The film revs high on all eight cylinders under its director, Sam Mendes, and its legendary cinematographer, Conrad Hall, but sputters like an old beat-up Ford with its strained tries to be memorable.

In epic style, "Road to Perdition" ponders the eternal theme of good versus evil living side by side, with a cinematic journey that puts the fragility of innocence up against the overwhelming powers of violence, envy and greed.

Up to its culminating and climactic scene, Mendes uses juxtaposed moving pictures of 1930's mob life to present a visual essay on which the gentle side of the human soul prevails over its malicious counterparts, as depicted by a band of ruthless, gun-toting gangsters.

A notorious hit man, played by Tom Hanks, is forced to redraw his priorities when his 12-year-old son witnesses a mob hit in a smuggler's warehouse. Father and son take to the road to save their lives and the remnants of their family from the villains in felt hats hot on their trail.

Mendes is undoubtedly one of the premiere directors working today. His ability to tell a story by stringing moving images together and letting the viewers piece its meaning together in their minds is unparalleled since, maybe, Stanley Kubrick's prime. Mendes understands film's visual nature; he never lets the temptation to tell the audience through dialog trump his ability to show them through pictures. A storytelling skill that is sadly dying away in Hollywood movies.

However, the film's emotion is self-indulgent and too worked out on paper beforehand; it lacks

the rawness to lift it from its wide-screen format and slam it in your heart and brain. Don't go to the theater expecting the second coming of the "Godfather."

The violence, the religious overtones and the messages of loyalty to family are not wheeled with the same cinematic command as Francis Coppola's mobster masterpiece. But in all fairness, what other movies do?

Part of the shortcomings in "Road to Perdition" is due to Tom Hanks. Hey, I enjoyed "Forrest Gump," too, but the guy stunk up the screen in this one. For the entire movie, it seemed Hanks recently ate a huge turkey dinner and hasn't been able to relieve himself since. It's call Ex-Lax, Tom. Either that, or leave the pretentiousness at home. It takes more than acting next to Paul Newman to make me forget the guy once wore nylons and a bad wig on "Bosom Buddies."

Yet, even with Hank's stomach discomforts, he is accompanied by a fine supporting cast that includes Jude Law, Stanley Tucci and Paul Newman, who is still, well, Paul Newman. Cool

Hand Luke lives on, even if he's in his 70s. These actors swiftly pick up Hanks' slack.

Jennifer Jason Leigh, who plays the mother, will always be that snoot-nosed kid from "Fast Times at Ridgemont High." The only good thing about her in this movie was she played in a bit part.

Despite the presence of an aging cinematic icon like Newman, the real star of this film was its photography, under the craftsmanship of veteran cinematographer Conrad Hall, who also shot such classics as "Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid" and "Cool Hand Luke," as well as the eye candy in the recent movies "Sleepy Hollow" and Mendes' first film, "American Beauty."

Hall takes the viewer on a tour de force through gritty back alleys and gangster warehouses to the rolling shores, countryside and diners of 1930's America. I am going to see this movie again for one reason only: to study Hall's work. If you're not a connoisseur of movie photography, here is a guy to start with.

Now, I give this movie a "4" because I'm comparing it along the lines of such unforgettable classics as the "Godfather" and "Cool Hand Luke," a place where this movie strives to be and deserves to be compared with, but falls way short of. The film shouldn't make any upcoming Greatest 100 lists.

However, if you put it next to the other current summer releases, i.e. "Men in Black 2" and "Bourne Identity," it is an "8," even with all its effort to be important.

Getting to the point: it's worth the ticket price, considering what else there is to choose from these days. Where have you gone, Francis Ford Coppola?

Backyard Beauties

Ponds add a serene focal point

Pondering: The art of creating a small body of water in your own back yard.

It starts innocently enough; maybe you spot it in a magazine photo or on a gardening program on the tube, at your local garden center or home improvement store, and you say to yourself, "I can do that!"

We're talking backyard ponds or water features — the biggest trend in gardening today, and for the do-it-yourselfer, it can be a labor-intensive but rewarding project.

A water feature can enhance the beauty of your yard as well as attract a variety of wildlife — from birds and squirrels that may stop by for a drink, to insects like butterflies and dragon flies. And it doesn't take long before the frogs move in.

The sound of running water created by the addition of a waterfall or fountain can be relaxing and help to drown street and other noises as well.

People are working harder these days, and "as a result when they come home, they want to relax more. They want the added tranquility (a water feature) gives them," said Nanette Winowiecki, co-owner of The Pond Place in Highland.

Building a backyard water feature is a good do-it-yourself project. It can be as simple as adding a bird bath or water fountain, but, for those who may be just a little more adventuresome and wish to add fish or water plants, a pond is the way to go.

Preformed ponds come in a

variety of sizes and shapes that are sunk into the ground and edged in rock or other materials to disguise its hard edge. Many have built-in plant shelves to hold pots of water plants.

By using a flexible liner, however, the size and shape of the pond is limited only by the imagination and physical strength of its creator. Flexible liners made specifically for pond construction offer a sturdy and durable alternative to using a preformed pond. Many come with an estimated life expectancy of 10-15 years, some as much as 50.

Winowiecki suggests customers bring in a drawing or photos of the area they are con-

sidering for the pond.

"It's one thing to describe it," she said, "but another to actually see the area they intend to use."

She said the most common mistake some people make when siting a pond, especially one that will include a waterfall, is not looking at which direction the waterfall is facing. If the waterfall will face away from the patio or deck then chances are the homeowner will not be able to enjoy the sound created by it.

"It's things like that that we can help out with," she said. It's a good idea for people to use a water hose or rope to lay out the pond design, even stake it out,

Winowiecki said, and to live with it awhile to make sure it is a good fit for the area and that it can be enjoyed from locations around the yard or from inside the house.

Once the site is determined, it's time to bring out the shovels or heavy-duty equipment to begin excavation.

That's what Bonnie Cirisan did 19 years ago. Cirisan had an in-ground swimming in her back yard that was no longer being used — her children had grown and moved on.

"I rented a Bobcat and had a go at it," Cirisan said.

For the first three years, she killed everything she put in to

that 9,000-gallon pond, Cirisan said, but since that time her knowledge of ponds, plants and fish has increased significantly. In fact, she's now known as "the pond lady" at Leppek Nursery in Brighton, where she is employed part time.

Her book, "Water Gardening. Easily, Naturally," is loaded with answers to the most commonly asked questions of water gardening and is available at Leppek's.

Cirisan doesn't believe in using chemicals. "The Boss made lakes and he got it right and I don't mess with success."

To be successful, people need to consider the ponds' location, the

number of plants and fish, and how often those fish are fed. She said one of the biggest mistakes people make is buying a pump that is not large enough to get the job done.

"Make sure you get a pump big enough for the job," she said. "Save money any place you can, but not on the pump," she said.

For those considering a backyard project such as installing a water garden or fish pond, many local garden and landscape centers, such as The Pond Place and Leppek's, offer classes and information; check your local phone directory for a place nearest you. Plenty of information is also available in books and on the Internet.

Another Kid's Fair area biggie is the Chevy Venture Give-Away.



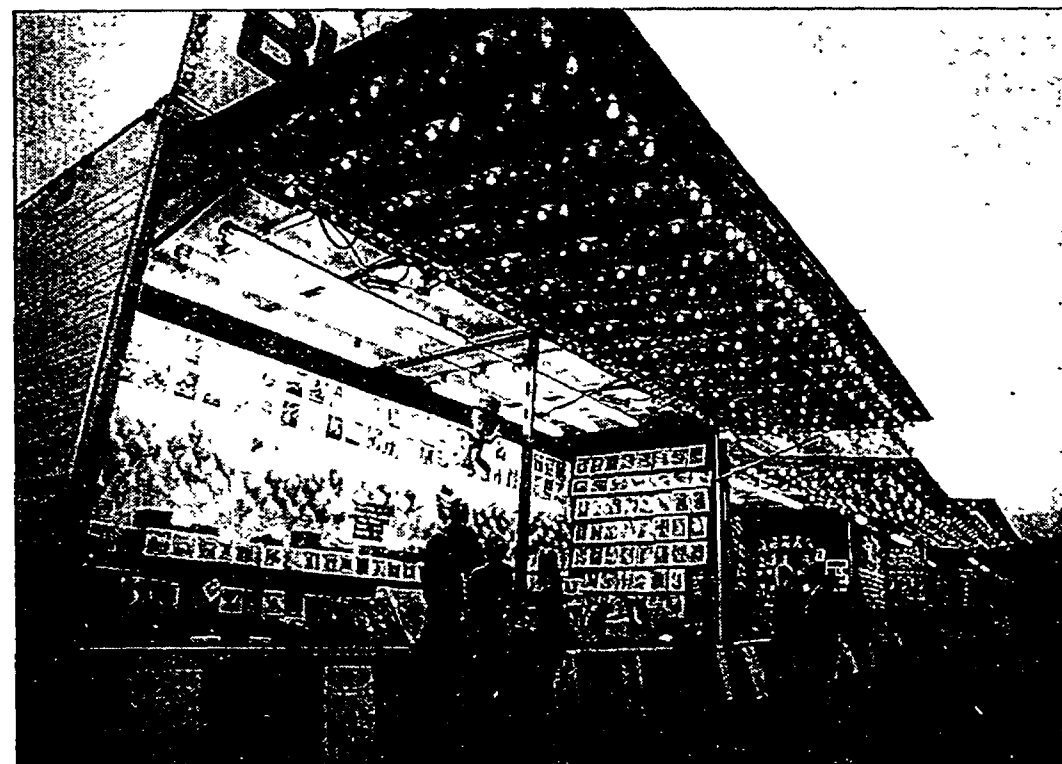

The Rascals will take the stage at 8 p.m. Admission is \$10.

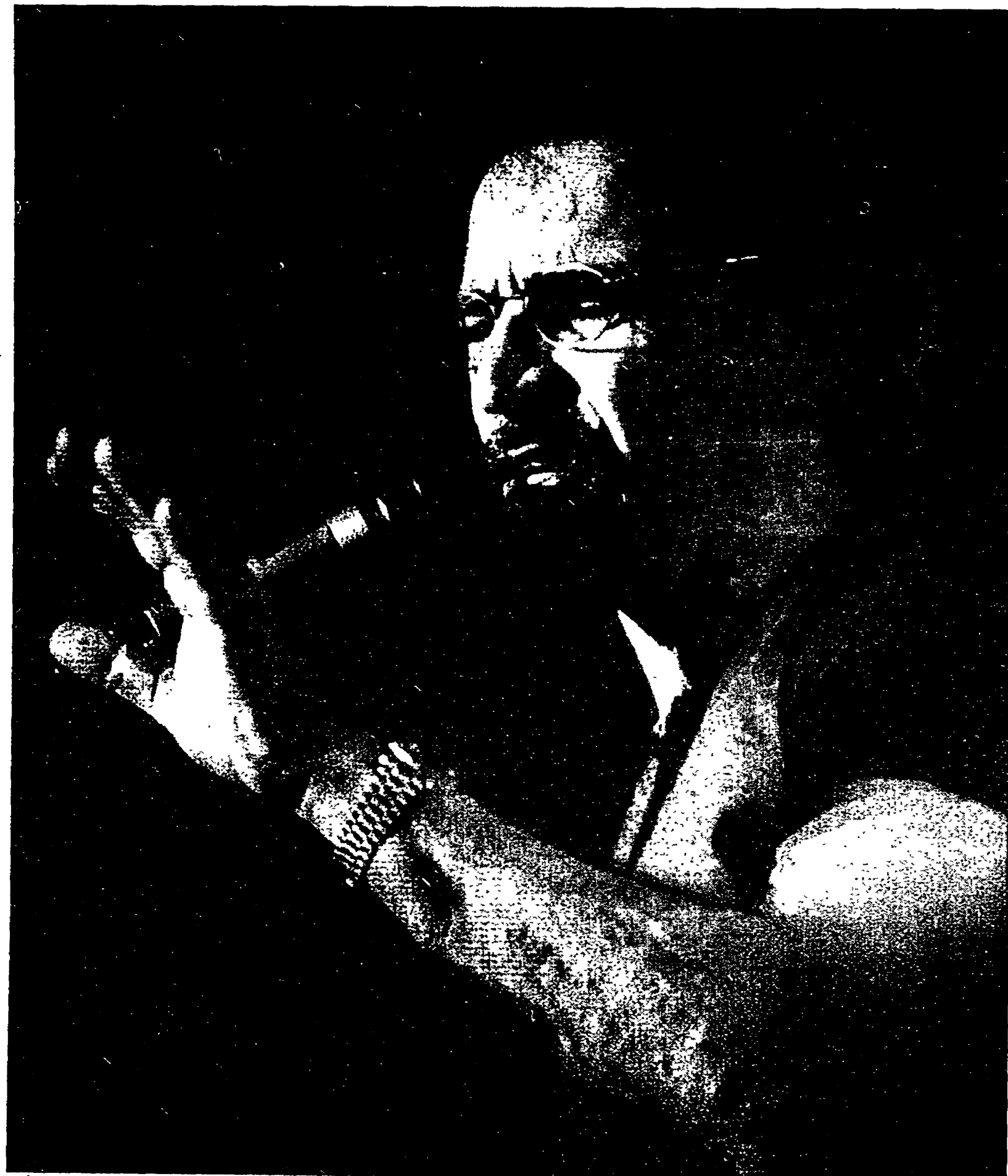

Detroit's own "Paz Man" brings his driving guitar

Mark "The Paz Man" Pasman, longtime host of the Motor City Bluez Project, an all blues music show featuring local and national bands on WCSX 94.7 FM in Detroit, will be up front and center in Novi with his band, Mudpuppy, on July 28.

The show begins at 7 p.m. Admission is free. The band plans to include two 45-minute sets at its Novi performance.

Mudpuppy offers up a mix of

blues and R&B sounds. Pasman picks guitar licks from the blues roots, like Robert Johnson, to experimental sounds of the Jon Spencer Blues Explosion.

The band picked up top honors at the 1998 Detroit Music Awards, winning Outstanding Blues Ensemble, Outstanding R&B Band and Outstanding Blues Recording for its 1997 release from Venture Records, "White Bread and Hot Sauce."

The awards came on the heels of winning Outstanding Blues

Ensemble and Outstanding Blues Recording for its self-titled 1996 Venture Records release, "Mudpuppy," at the 1997 Detroit Music Awards, as well as taking home the Best Blues Band award at the 1997 International Blues Festival Awards.

Mudpuppy also features lead singer and bass player Paul Randolph, who has earned best R&B vocalist honors at the Motor City Music Awards. The band is rounded out by percussionist Lorenzo "Spoons"

Brown, drummer Darryl Pierce and keyboards player Mark Thibodeau.

On past albums, the Detroit group has featured a blues and funky twist to such classic songs as "Kansas City," "Call the Plumber," and the Sly and the Family Stone number "Thank You."

Over the years, Mudpuppy has joined many legendary artists on stage, including blues giants Buddy Guy, Robert Cray, Junior Wells, Koko Taylor, James Cotton and J.J. Cale.

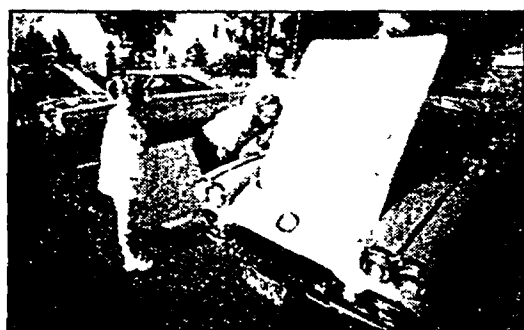
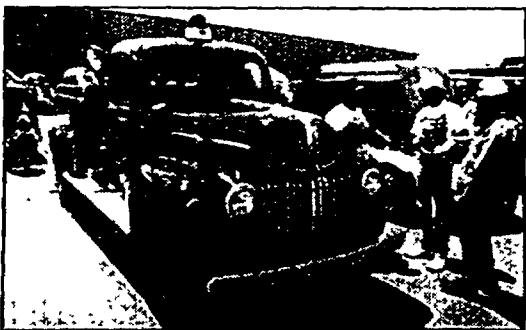

And who can forget the Ford Mustang?

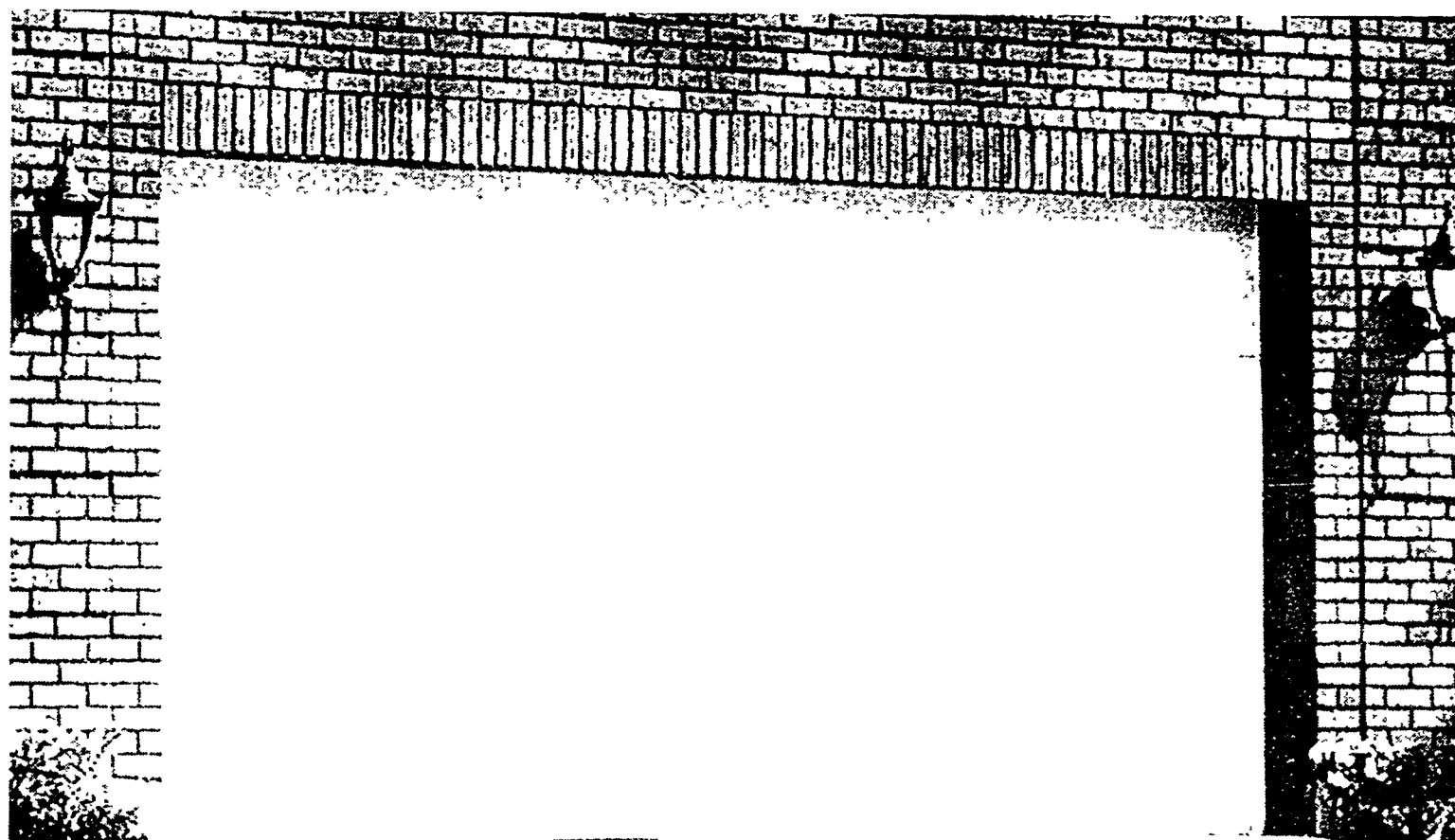

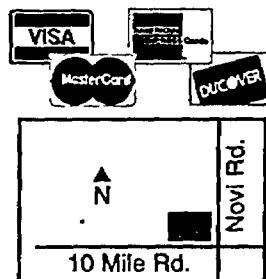

In addition to Don Gruendler Jr. on drums and Dale Jennings on bass, featured guests include Holmstrom and Mugalian, as well as the harmonica playing of Gregg "Fingers" Taylor (of Jimmy Buffett fame) and the swinging harp lines of Brian Miller. Multi-instrumentalist Denny Freeman adds his touch on piano and former Johnnie Bassett sideman Chris Codish helps out on organ.

Based on the strength of this recording and the years spent paying dues behind the originators, Doug Deming and the Jewel Tones are poised to hit the road and make a strong impact on today's blues scene.

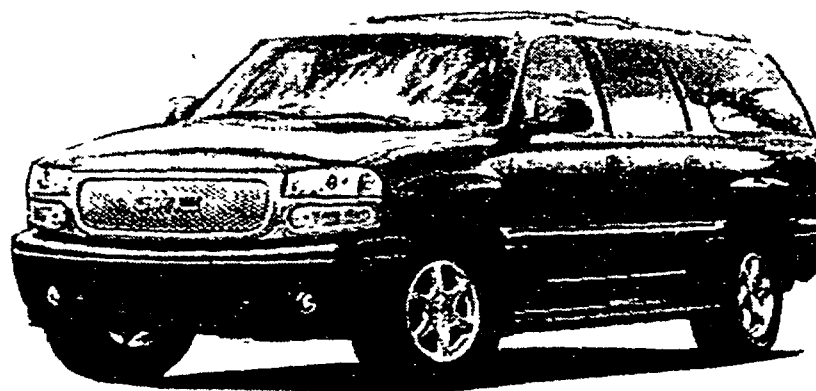

HELICOPTER RIDES



Hop on a Aerospatiale B-50 Super Bee

Whipping through the air at 120 miles per hour at an altitude of 500 feet with the sound of blades chopping through the air above you while the ground below you just sails by — now that's a rush.

For those who have never had the chance to ride in a heli-

copter — and those who have and want to do it again — Walton Helicopter is going to be providing the rare chance for people to experience the fun and thrill of flying in a helicopter when they bring their Aerospatiale B-50 Super Bee tour helicopter to the 11th Annual Music & Motor Festival July 25-28.

"It's the same kind of helicopter that they use in places like Hawaii, Las Vegas and Alaska," said Lynn Walton, the pilot, via a phone interview as he was in St. Ignace to offer flights over the Straights of Mackinac. "It's a touring helicopter. It holds five passengers and myself during a trip."

Each trip, which will cost \$30 per person, will last approximately six minutes as

the vehicle cruises into the air above Novi and covers just about 12 miles in that amount of time.

"Everyone should bring their cameras too," Walton said. "They will be able to get some nice aerial photos of the area so they can show their friends and family that they flew in a helicopter."

Walton's wife, Paula, noted that the major difference between helicopters and aircraft such as small planes is the smooth ride.

"It is a really gentle ride," she said. "Not to mention it has a lot better visibility than if you were tucked in the back of a little plane."

Walton agreed, saying you might as well be relaxing in your living room.

"It's really smooth and a lot of fun," he said. "It's like you're sitting in your Lazy Boy chair at home."

Walton, who has been flying helicopter for about 20 years, brings his air-born vessel to multiple festivals and shows to offer the people there the chance to take a little trip in the air.

"People seem to really enjoy it, I know I do," he said.

Even if the weather gets a little windy, the rides must go on — and don't worry, there's no problem for a helicopter to deal with the wind.

"The wind doesn't really do anything to a helicopter," Paula Walton said. "It is such a big helicopter that it cuts right through it."

Erie Street: Windsor's Little Italy

The vitality and flavour of Italy are yours to experience on Windsor's Via Italia

Of all the neighbourhoods in Windsor one of the most colourful and exciting is 'Via Italia'.

Its official name is Erie Street and it's a community in itself with a history as rich as any in Windsor.

A neighbourhood is more than just houses or the people who live next door. Often it extends to cover many blocks, encompassing people with shared common interests, backgrounds or experiences of immigrating to a new country.

The structure that binds the Erie Street neighbourhood is, of course, the Italian church. Sant' Angela Merici started it all, making Via Italia the most vibrant and spirited neighbourhood in the city.

In 1938, Father Constantino DeSantis arrived from Atlantic City, N.J. with the mandate to build a church for the Italian families of Windsor. Fundraising within the community took place and a major loan from the diocese of London allowed

the cornerstone of Sant' Angela Merici to be laid one year later.

As the chapel was created, the Italian community of the surrounding Erie Street area began to grow.

A young participant in the Tour di Via Italia cycles in the annual event which is held every September for cyclists of every calibre.

From there, a succession of small, family run businesses began opening up, each bringing a piece of Italy with them — its culture, clothing boutiques, custom shops, markets, bakeries, eateries, and festivals that attract people from all over Canada and the U.S.

The added beauty of the street is that it is made up of people who live on the crossstreets of Erie Street. The youths and the elderly sit on the patios of the café enjoying a cappuccino or just having an



ice cream.

The best element of Erie Street is the commercial section, located a short distance from downtown yet stretching from Howard to Gladstone. These stores and shops offer many tasteful delights or imported treasures.

The greatest pleasures are taking a walk on the street and trying to resist the aromas of pizza and fresh bread baking in the wood-burning oven.

What makes Erie Street more than just a street is the ambiance of its residential

neighbourhood; by comparison, Greektown does not have the same effect. In large part, that's due to St. Angela church but also to a community that values its seniors whose needs are fulfilled by being so close to all amenities.

Anything one could wish for can be found on Erie Street. Spend the evening at one of its fine restaurants — you will be treated well, given customer service and served delicious food. Most of all you will be welcomed in to share in the feeling and family unit of Little Italy.

Over the years changes to Erie Street have been sparked with the implementing of the Business Improvement Association (BIA) in 1984. These changes have also been brought on by European influence and by Canadians and Americans who form an increasingly large market for Italian specialty foods and products.

Years ago when Erie Street adopted the name Via Italia there was some controversy in the non-Italian community. A few people saw it as the Italians separating themselves from the rest of the community.

Over the last few years Windsorites have come a long way to realize and appreciate the values of Via Italia. It is Windsor's answer to Greektown, only closer.

Today's clientele on Erie Street represents a varied cross-section of the whole community in contrast to years ago when it used to be predominantly Italians.

Erie Street has not been immune to general economic influences and it's also generally expected that along the Via Italia the community's image will grow and be even bigger than it is today.

Via Italia is like a trip to Italy without getting on a plane.

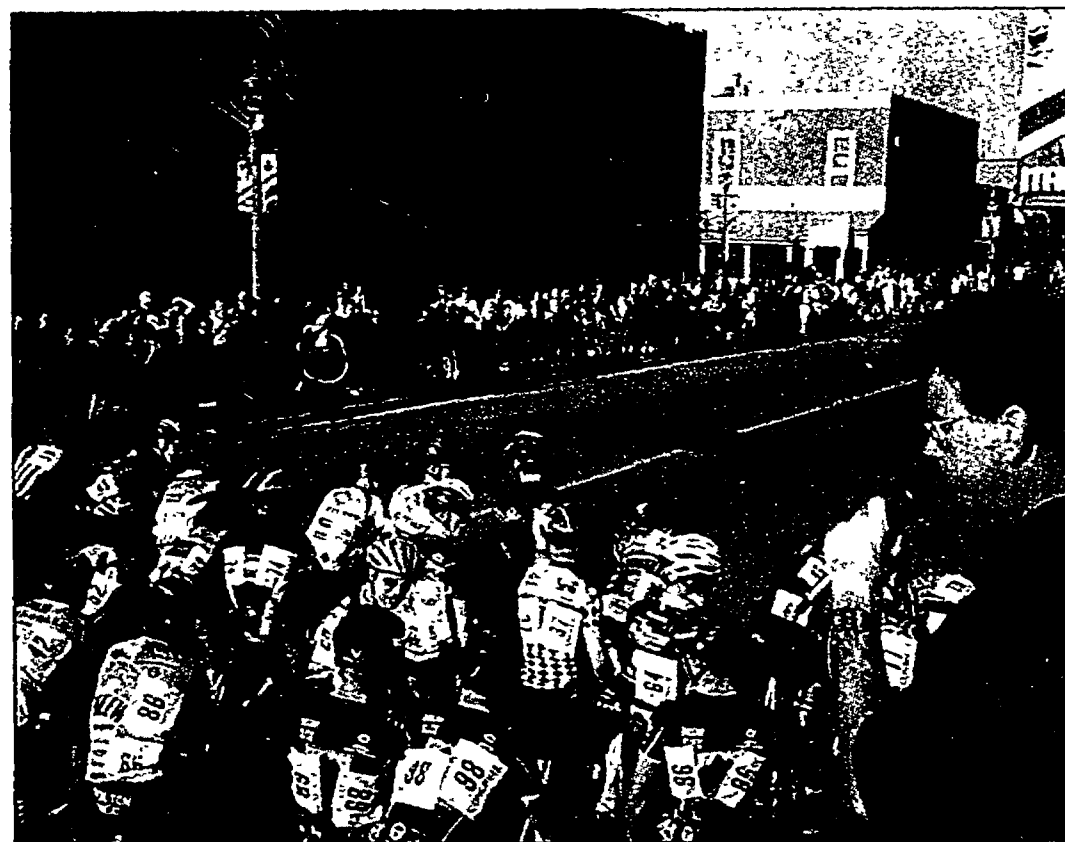

After a lot of practice, John started entertaining audiences with the magic of his yo-yo. He has been entertaining crowds with his yo for eight years.

He began and still is a "busker," an ancient term meaning one who entertains for monetary tokens. His comedy has taken him to Turkey, Italy, Spain, Japan, Singapore, Canada, and the U.S.

In 1996, John drove his grandpa's Buick down to the desert to go to a yo-yo competition. There he met members of World Team ProYo, Yo-Hans and Kate as well as owners of Playmaxx. A couple of year's later, they asked John to become a member of World Team ProYo.

The bilingual artist's work intermingles styles of theatre, comedy, and circus. He is a suave post-modern retro-dude known for his professionalism both on and off stage.

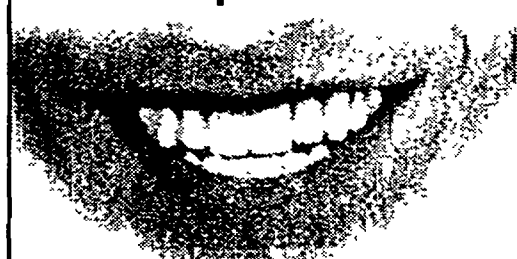

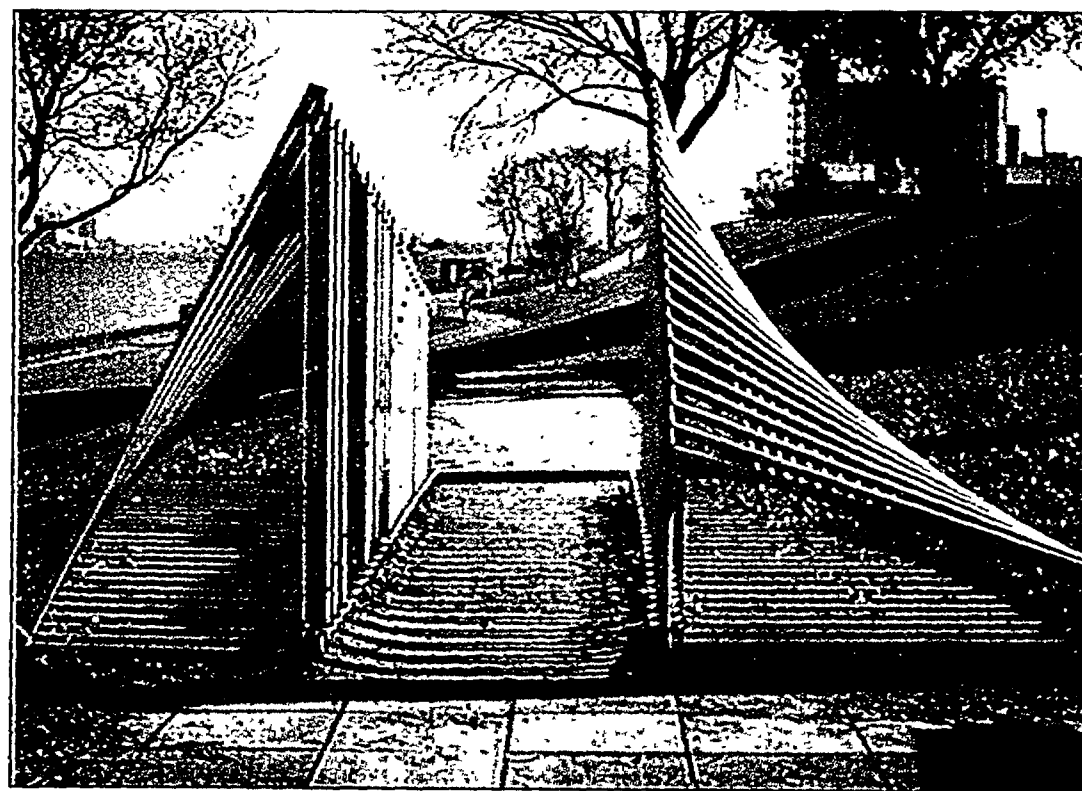

Sculptor Ian Lazarus intended to create a dynamic interaction between the sculpture, its setting or site, and the viewer who engages it.

The sculpture deals with a lyrical phrasing of space, inviting viewers to move through it as one would move through music if it could be made visible. The sculptor attempts to restructure the existing landscape to take advantage of its inherent beauty while drawing on his sculptural languages and forms to augment the dialogue.

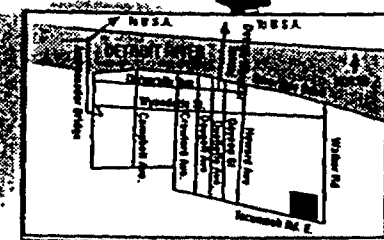

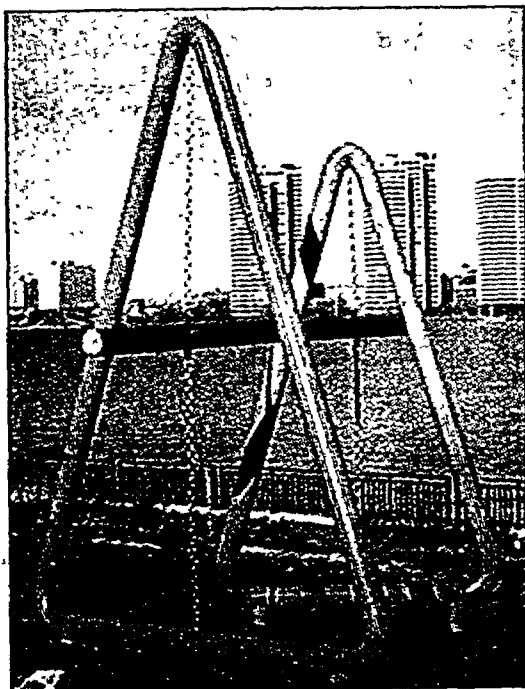

Consophia

The two painted steel triangles are linked with a horizontal boom suspended by stainless steel chains, presenting horizontal and vertical communication between the sculpture and its location.

The sculpture symbolically reflects communication across borders - standing as it does within the shadow of the international Ambassador Bridge, which links the U.S. and Canada. With the carved Ojibway syllabic on the moving beam, it also presents the native ability to cross borders and communicate across countries.

The title is unique. A coined word created by the sculptor, Consophia refers to wisdom among friends.

Linking this sculpture with the geometric syllabics of the native Ojibway script, the sculptor presents a form which represents sharing among friends. The sculpture presents the sharing of feeling, compassion, emotion, inspiration, harmony, collaboration, interaction, synchronicity and the conscious exchange to benefit many.

The English translation of the Ojibway is sharing knowledge and inspired interaction. This translation further expands this sculpture metaphor of communication across culture, location and time.

Consophia was created for the Odette Sculpture Park in 2000.
